# Drive to break up transport 'mafia'

PHUKET: In an attempt to improve public transport on the island, Governor Udomsak Usawarangkura has announced his support for a new project aimed at putting hundreds of metered taxis on Phuket roads and launching an Airport Bus service.

On April 1, the Governor presided over the launch of the "Taxi Phuket Development Project" at Central Festival, during which he also announced the introduction of a new 52-baht minibus service between Phuket City and the airport.

The 30-seat minibus, to go into service in about three months, will stop at four locations: Surakul Stadium on Wichit Songkram Rd; Tesco-Lotus; the Heroines' Monument and Pranangsang Temple, on Thepkrasattri Rd in Thalang.

The new taxis are station wagons with seating for seven and more luggage room than the standard metered taxis. Built by Bangkok-based car manufacturer Thai Rung Union Car (TUC), the "Thai Rung Bangkok Limousine Express" vehicles have Isuzu 3,000cc engines and are available for purchase at 920,000 baht on a low-interest instalment plan through the Small and Medium Enterprise Development Bank (SME Bank).

Prospective buyers can set themselves up as taxi drivers for a down payment of 229,000 baht, paying off the balance over a five-year period at just 5% interest. No collateral is required, though buyers must have a personal guarantor.

Teerayuth Prasertphol, Chief Technical Officer of the

Phuket Provincial Transportation Office (PPTO), told the *Gazette* that the taxi fare will be 50 baht for the first two kilometers, then 7 baht per kilometer thereafter.

While this is more expensive than metered taxi fares in Bangkok, the 20km trip between Patong and Phuket City, for example, would cost 176 baht – about half what most tuk-tuks currently demand for the same journey.

K. Teerayuth added that the metered-taxi registration process takes one day and costs less than 2,000 baht.

At the launch, Gov Udomsak said he would like to see public transport in Phuket improve and provide more options for tourists.

"Currently we have only

about 20 metered taxis. I would like eventually to see all black-plate [illegal] taxis become registered. We also want to add more metered taxis," he said.

"Some metered taxis in Phuket are still barred from picking up passengers at certain hotels. We would like them to be able to collect fares from anywhere on the island. It's a necessary thing that we must do," he said, adding that he was willing to take on "influential figures" to make it so.

Gov Udomsak encouraged tuk-tuk drivers in Patong whose vehicles were damaged by the the tsunami to switch over to metered taxis and also encouraged black-plate taxi drivers to take advantage of the SME loans and operate legally.

# Burmese tsunami survivors in limbo

PHANG NGA: They came to Thailand in search of a better life, but now thousands of Burmese who survived the very worst of the tsunami are languishing in Phang Nga, unaided and in hiding, while the bodies of dead Burmese lie unidentified in the mortuaries.

The majority of the survivors claim they are in Thailand legally, but that they lost their papers in the tsunami. As a result, they are afraid to approach the Thai authorities for help, for fear of deportation.

The Burmese government says there are no Burmese in Thailand, and so refuses to intervene to help them.

The Ranong-based Suphamitr Foundation set up a relief center in Khao Lak, but, according to manager Chuwong Sangkong, staff were forced to close the center on January 10, after being threatened by employers worried that they might lose their cheap labor.

The foundation had by that time enabled 712 migrants to return to Burma by giving them 500 baht each and helping them to reach the Burmese border at Ranong.

Said K. Chuwong, "The employers threatened to harm our staff if they continued to help the laborers, because they wanted to continue using them after the tsunami, and didn't want to lose them.

"The employers keep [the Burmese] hidden from the authorities who may be able to help them, while the laborers are afraid that if they attract atten-

# Boared to death

PHAYAO: An elderly hunter in Chun District was gored to death by a wild boar after shooting its mate and stealing their four babies, his neighbors said.

In late March, Wun Sisan, 68, shot a female boar and collected its piglets to sell to villagers to raise at a cost of 1,500 baht each.

About 10 days later, in the early evening of April 4, the little pigs were still penned up near his home when K. Wun heard the sound of a wild boar approaching, making sounds as if calling out for the babies.

Not believing his luck, K. Wan took out a rifle and followed in hot pursuit. He finally got in range along a creek in a sugar cane field and blasted away, hitting the animal.

Rather than roll over and die, however, the boar charged K. Wan, jumping atop him, gouging him with his long canines and trampling him under underhoof.

Villagers ran to help, but it was too late. The boar had pounced and gored the last living breaths out of his assailant.

The boar fared no better – it, too, died at the scene. By the time police came to investigate, the neighbors had already butchered the 120-kilogram animal and shared the meat among themselves. *Source: Thai Rath* 



# US trade reps assess ways to help SMEs

PHUKET CITY: Phuket Governor Udomsak Usawarangkura met with US trade representatives and the head of the Office of Small and Medium Enterprise Promotion (OSMEP) on April 3 to discuss ways in which the US private sector might assist in Thailand's recovery following the December 26 tsunami.

The talks focused on ways to channel private-sector investment from the US to affected businesses, given the Thai government's decision not to accept direct economic aid from foreign governments.

A key issue in the discussions was the role the proposed Thai-US Free Trade Agreement (FTA) would play in facilitating loans to small businesses that have been unable to obtain credit from Thai lending institutions.

The eight-member US contingent in Phuket was led by Assistant US Trade Representative Barbara Weizel, who heads a 60-member negotiating team visiting Thailand for the third round of of the somewhat controversial FTA negotiations in Pattaya.

Ms Weizel said the talks

had been productive. "Today we were looking at tsunami-affected areas and spoke with local officials ... to get a better understanding of the situation here and how we can help.

"They gave us a good explanation of areas where they need assistance, as well as longer-term recovery plans, including for SMEs, tourism, fisheries and others," she added.

She said the talks had made her team realize the importance the Thai government places on SMEs, adding that the FTA group was working on other areas that would lead to long-term economic growth and elimination of poverty in Thailand.

"What we are doing today is part of a bigger effort," she said.

Dulce A Aahniser, Deputy Chief of Staff of the Oversea Private Investment Corporation said that her agency had set aside credits totaling US\$150 million (about 6 billion baht) as part of its Tsunami Reconstruction Finance Initiative.

## Police coax would-be jumper to safety

PATONG: A drunken man horrified people in the Soi Kebsap area of Patong on the morning of April 7 by threatening to jump to his death from the 18<sup>th</sup> floor of the Patong Tower.

The drama started at about 8:30 am after the man, who police have identified only as

"Aek", put a over the balcony railing and flailed his arms.

Pol Lt Col Narong Laksanawimol of the Kathu Police Station led a team of 15 officers to the scene, where a 5x5-meter air cushion was deployed on the ground to break Aek's fall if he went though with his threat.

Col Narong was one of four negotiators who, after about two hours of persuasion, finally convinced the man to come down. The colonel later told the *Gazette* that Aek had become distraught after an argument with his girlfriend and was out of control from alcohol.

The negotiations were slow, he added, because the man was afraid of the police and initially refused to talk to them.

Col Narong said he explained to Aek that they would not press charges. They then asked him to think about his family and the effect it would have on them if he jumped.

After giving up his suicide bid, Aek was escorted to Patong Hospital for treatment.

tion to themselves, the Thai authorities will catch them and send them back to Myanmar because they don't have ID papers."

The foundation has been unable to keep track of Burmese tsunami survivors since the center closed, but K. Chuwong estimates that there may be as many as 2,000 of them in difficulty.

Before the tsunami, there were around 33,000 Burmese registered with the Phang Nga Labor Office. Many were in Phang Nga doing unskilled jobs, as housekeepers or gardeners in hotels around Khao Lak, or on fishing boats based in villages such as Baan Nam Khem.

K. Chuwong believes that although 3,000 migrants fled back into Myanmar, and scores died in the tsunami, a "huge number" remain in Phang Nga.

He said he had asked the Burmese Embassy in Bangkok to help the survivors, but embassy staff refused, saying that they had been told by Yangon that there were no Burmese laborers in Thailand.

"So, no Burmese laborers died in Thailand and there are no laborers here who need the help of the Burmese government," said K. Chuwong, referring, with an edge in his voice, to the reply from the Burmese Embassy.

Adisorn Kerdmongkon, committee member of the Campaign for Democracy in Burma (CCDB), said most of the laborers seemed to be in hiding in three places: Baan Nam Khem, Khao Lak and Laem Pakarang.

CCDB officers believe they may be staying with friends who are working, although it is thought that around 90% of surviving Burmese migrants lost their jobs because of the tsunami.

K. Adisorn said the CCDB intends to track down the laborers and take them to the Phang Nga Provincial Labor Office, where they can re-register.

At some time in the future, the committee hopes to arrange some form of liaison between the laborers and the Thai Tsunami Victims Identification Center, to enable Burmese victims of the tsunami to be identified.

#### Park fees waived till end of May

PHUKET: Entry to marine national parks and 15 other natural attractions along the Andaman coast provinces will be free of charge until May 31.

Sirinath National Park in Phuket was due to re-open on April 9. Head of the park, Thanapong Aphaiso, said, "Some areas in the park will not be open to visitors because we are rejuvenating them and they will be reopened later.

"In addition, we are building a hostel with bathrooms, and a car park," he added.

# Missing millions probe 'making progress'

PHUKET CITY: Phuket City Police say they are making progress in the investigation into the alleged theft of 2.05 million baht in tsunami relief funds from Phuket Provincial Hall - but have yet to name any suspects in the

Phuket City Police Superintendent Pol Col Paween Pongsirin told the Gazette on April 3 that he expected his department to have "cleared up" the case before the Songkran holiday, but he declined to elaborate for fear, he said, of jeopardizing the case.

The money, part of funds intended for

distribution to tsunami victims though the the police investigation, which found evi-Office of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (ODPM), was reported missing from a box at Phuket Provincial Hall on February 15.

Phuket Governor Udomsak Usawarangkura assigned Vice-Governor Supachai Yuwaboon to lead an investigation team into the disappearance. On March 11 the V/Gov said his commission had concluded that the money had been "lost" through "poor accounting" by the ODPM officers charged with distributing it.

This finding was strangely at odds with

dence that someone had sawn though one of the locks on the box and pried back its cover.

"We are conducting the investigation as rapidly and thoroughly as possible but have yet to name any suspects. Everything must be finished before Songkran or the middle of the month," said Col Paween.

Col Paween did not specify whether "finishing the case" referred to the collection of evidence, the naming of suspects, or the filing of criminal charges.

# Sipa launches 3-hour service for IT experts

BANGKOK: Foreign IT workers coming to Thailand will be the envy of employees in all other sectors following the April 7 launch of a new online system by the Software Industry Promotion Agency (Sipa).

The system will allow the government to process foreign IT workers' applications for work permits and extensions of stay within just three hours.

Chalermcharn Yotviriyapanit, Head of the Sipa's Investment Promotion Section, told the Gazette that foreigners may now apply online for a "Knowledge Worker Certificate" ratifying that they are recognized by the Thai government as IT specialists.

The certificate entitles applicants to have work permits and extensions to stay processed within three hours through Sipa's One-Stop Service Center.

To be issued a certificate,

foreign IT workers who have been offered a job in Thailand can fill out the form at www.sipa. or.th/knowledgeworker/apply.

"Sipa will process the initial application within five days," explained K. Chalermcharn, adding that once the applicant has arrived in Thailand, he or she may then apply in person to Sipa's One-Stop Service Center for a work permit and an extension to stay equivalent to the duration of the contract of employ-

"If all documents are in order, the work permit and extension to stay will be issued within three hours," he said.

#### Phuket Air 747 grounded after safety check

LONDON: Passengers booked on Phuket Air flights were left in limbo after one aircraft was grounded because of "serious defects" and another was barred from carrying passengers.

Safety inspectors in London prevented the Boeing 747-200 from taking off after they discovered the collision avoidance system was broken. The aircraft had returned to Gatwick after one engine shut down.

The British Department for Transport ordered emergency inspections of all Phuket Air planes on British soil on April 4, after a flight from Bangkok to London had twice aborted take-off after refueling at Sharjah in the United Arab Emirates.

Passengers forced the crew to stop the plane after seeing fuel gushing from a wing. The airline said later that this was due to over-filling, and posed no danger.

British Civil Aviation Authority officials who inspected the 25-year-old plane when it finally arrived at Gatwick – 36 hours late – found the evacuation safety lights – meant to indicate escape routes during an emergency – were not working.

The plane was deemed air-

worthy and allowed to return to Bangkok – but without passen-

Then, on April 6, another Phuket Air 747 had to return to Gatwick three hours into a flight to Bangkok, because of a hydraulic fault. One engine was shut off while the plane was airborne.

The plane had already spent 11 hours on the ground at Sharjah during the flight to Gatwick, while repairs were carried out. It was thought the problem had been fixed, but it recurred during the return flight to Bangkok.


Attempts by the Gazette to obtain a comment from the airline were unsuccessful.

Before the start of the four days of problems. Phuket Air announced that is was axing the direct service between Bangkok and London because of the impending low season, and replacing the route with a new one between Bangkok and Amsterdam.

The airline's marketing and communications manager, Krona Visutrasai, told the Gazette the London flights would be "suspended temporarily", but that the company intended to restore the route later.



ne needs only seventeen muscles to smile; yet one should never underestimate the power of a smile. A smile can reconcile two enemies, brighten the life of a stranger, cheer up a room with an atmosphere of goodwill and happiness, or give a glowing first impression.

From this, one can logically surmise that since Thailand is the renowned Land of Smiles, it is one of the most powerful countries in the world. No, Thailand does not have enough nuclear weapons to obliterate our world n times. Neither does it have a ridiculously large army, hundreds of angry battleships, flocks of military planes, or hidden Weapons of Mass Destruction – but 60.6 million grinning people should be a force to be reckoned with.

Events of the past few years, however, have seriously shaken my belief in the power of a smile – or indeed, in the power of any single person's benevolence and hope.

Thailand's "war on drugs" during February and March 2003 ended in the deaths of over 2,000 people, including children under the age of 16 months. SARS descended on Southeast Asia, and after menacingly circling Thailand, it finally struck in March 2003. We became consumed in panic, seemingly unable to protect ourselves with anything but flimsy white mouth masks.

Avian flu came a few months after that, referred to merely as "the dark side of globalization" by the Thai PM Thaksin Shinawatra, and we watched in awe how quickly it spread. As it brought us the stench of burned chicken corpses, hanging in the air with our own palpable fear, we despaired that things would ever return to normal.

In that same year, Muslim separatist activity in the South of Thailand reached its boiling point, and from my sheltered home in Thailand's favourite tourist island Phuket, I learned of the terrorist attacks in Pattani and

other states of the South, where students my age still live in fear for their lives.

On December 26th, 2004, a tsunami hit our shores and we could not smile for a long time.

Like most teenagers, I went through a period of fierce idealism. Fueled by John Grisham's The Street Lawyer, I was determined to become a lawyer and help all manner of people (although I wasn't exactly sure of how, but my thirteen-year-old self smoothed over those details).

I held all manner of Utopian dreams: peace, equality and education for all, the complete eradication of social injustice, governments that were not corrupt, and so on. They were typical run-of-the-mill hopes, and the realization gradually sank in that I had little chance of actually achieving them.

Feeling jaded and cheated by the fact that nothing in the world changed, no matter how hard I tried, I buried myself in my studies.

It was not a miraculous epiphany that pulled me out of this mindset, but an innocuous comment by my physics teacher, on a wholly ordinary Wednesday morning. "Newton's Third Law stipulates that for every action there is an equal and opposite reaction," he said.

Seeing our half-asleep faces, he grinned and went on, "That means that if I push the Earth, the Earth should push me back. Anyone care to test that theory?"

My friend and I glanced at each other. Glad to get away from mind-numbing physics formulas, we both got up and looked at him expectantly. He gestured to us encouragingly and said, "Jump." We did so half-heartedly.

Turning back to the rest of the class, secret amusement showing through his face at the sight of our own bemusement, he said proudly, "Congratulations. You have just moved the world."

It was then that I realised that it is the little things that make our lives infinitely more wonderful, as my grandmother insists (and which I had always dismissed as a touch of senility).

Perhaps the smallest thing of all is a smile; so often unacknowledged and so often forced for the flash of the camera, smiles dominate all my earliest memories of Thailand. I remember being three years old, in the arms of my father as he strolled through the muggy heat of Bangkok's streets, people smiling at me from all sides, flashes of white teeth against brown skin.

Back in Germany, I experimentally smiled at people in shopping centers or on crowded streets, only to have them glance back at me with faint confusion, as if wondering if they knew me, and then dismissing me as soon as they remembered something more important.

It seems that Thailand is one of the few nations left where Newton's Third Law holds true in the context of smiles: if you smile at someone, they will smile back.

After the tsunami, many of us were afraid to smile, for fear that it would be insensitive to those who were grieving – but when one feels so utterly powerless in the wake of a natural disaster, the one thing one can do with absolutely certainty is smile.

And smile we did. Amid the shock and grief, Thais were still strong enough to smile and to show compassion to the thousands of foreigners who had suffered. A sense of solidarity swept over us, and people as far away as Bangkok stormed hospitals to donate blood, clothing, food and other necessities.

Smiling is universal and simple. It does not matter whether you have white teeth contrasting with dark skin or pale skin, or if your teeth are crooked, or yellowed with age. It does not matter if your wrinkles show, or if sunlight reflects off your shiny new braces.

What matters is that we are all capable of it, regardless of gender, nationality, religion or political belief. A smile may not go very far in stopping a bullet, or bringing money into a desperately poor country – but it is a start. We can all do our part, no matter how infinitesimally insignificant it may seem compared to other events.

As the Land of Smiles, we have an obligation to set an example to the rest of the world. If smiles really are infections, then we should start an epidemic.





hen my son-in-law shot me through the head last week I honestly didn't feel a thing. There was no blood, no spattered brains against the wall, only a mischievous giggle and a sort of *kerblumph* sound from the 4.5-kilogram gun.

The scene of the crime was "Jungle Squad" in Kathu, where you can stalk and eventually shoot down friends, enemies and that annoying person from the office who you've wanted to get back at for years.

But is crawling through 10 rai of former rubber plantation, sweating copiously, heart hammering away, actually fun? You bet it is.

Firing an invisible laser beam for a distance of up to 150 meters at adversaries who really, actually and honestly want to "kill" you brings out the Grunt in people of any age or gender.

The harmless (luckily for me) beam is aimed at a sensor, attached by Velcro to each combatant's hat. When the beam finds its target, the sensor notifies the gun which "fired" it, and yet one more life is tragically lost in the steamy jungles of Southeast Asia.

That is not the end of the story, though, as combatants may have several "lives", depending on the rules of the game they are playing.

Jungle Squad arrived on the island last November. It is the

first outdoor laser combat game company in Thailand.

Managing Director Nigel Burt recalled that the process of importing 30 life-size guns into Thailand wasn't exactly easy.

Each replica requires a separate real-life firearms license, as local authorities are understandably jittery about people running around the island shooting each other up, even with lasers. Let's face it, there's enough of that around election time.

Like local political maneuvering, the one-hour game fires up passions that can sometimes lead to embarrassing moments.

At an opening promotion party last year, two expats – who shall not be named – overstepped the game's physical boundaries by leaving the rubber plantation, and promptly got themselves arrested at a local police booth for illegal possession of firearms.

One could hardly blame the arresting officers, as the 80,000-baht Marita and M-16 replicas do look uncannily real. Happily, the misunderstanding was soon cleared up with smiles all around.

The game is more enjoyable with a large number of participants, but if a couple of friends want to drop by for a rum-

ble in the jungle, staff members will make up the numbers, either as opponents or as team members.

Mr Burt has 14 years' experience organizing war games on the Isle of Wight in England, and he is convinced of his laser guns' superiority in this field of recreation.

"This is real jungle combat minus the pain and the mess." he said. "It's a lot cheaper than similar concepts, plus it's environmentally benign and it's safe." Well, safe if you're not like the over-enthusiastic American sailor on R&R who recently tripped in the undergrowth, went flying stern over bowsprit, and ended up in the dentist's chair.

It's easy to imagine Jungle Squad being a haven for testosterone-laden blokes, but ladies acquire the skills of hunting and surviving just as well as, if not better than, the boys, Mr Burt said.

"Ladies possess the one talent that is required to survive and

do well at this game: patience," he explained.

The heavy gun is awkward for smaller children to handle, but anyone between the ages of 10 and 84 can have had a go at being GI Joe, and more and more want to try.

Mr Burt said Jungle Squad is a perfect team-building activity, one that his squad can set up quickly on hotel or even office grounds – whatever the terrain.

In a word, the concept has limitless possibilities: in the open, in the jungle, building-to-building, beachside, anywhere – just so long as you don't scare the buffaloes.

Jungle Squad provides combatants with camouflage boiler suits and hats; Mr Burt recommends trainers as footwear. But apart from that, combatants set their own rules.

There is, though, just one proviso: Mr Burt is the ultimate judge, and cheating is nigh-on impossible. There's no room for Cowboys-and-Indians-style "You're dead," "No, I'm not," "Oh yes you are," squabbles here: the gun and head sensors register everything.

Sorry about that; it's the Law of the Jungle, you see.





# No lag from Jag

t the Detroit show in January, before snow blocked off large parts of North America, a number of top manufacturers unveiled some interesting concept vehicles. Among these was one from Ford's Premier Automotive Group (PAG) Jaguar division: the Advanced Lightweight Coupé.

Designed by Ian Callum, the man responsible for the Aston Martin DB7, as well as Jaguar's own aluminum-bodied XJ8, the new coupé is also produced in this lightweight metal.

In recent years, Jaguar has been hemorrhaging cash. Indeed, of the four PAG companies – the others are Aston Martin, Land Rover and Volvo – only Volvo is contributing to Ford's coffers.

Jaguar has sold its Formula 1 team to Red Bull and will close its famous Brown's Lane factory in Coventry, all in an effort to bring the company back into profit. The Detroit concept car may be the answer.

Jaguar Chairman and CEO Joe Greenwell said: "The Advanced Lightweight Coupé represents the very essence of Jaguar, its heart and soul. If you want to know what lies ahead for us, what direction we will take – this is Jaguar's answer."

The car rides on 21-inch alloy wheels, fitted with ultralow profile Pirelli tires, giving it the typically aggressive pouncing

profile of all Jags while, toward the rear, the cabin flows back into a clean tail with twin exhausts.

P o w - ered by Jaguar's normally-aspirated V8 motor, the ALC will get to 100kmh from rest in a

little over five seconds and – if not electronically governed – has a top speed in excess of 290kmh.



"The Advanced Lightweight Coupl represents the very essence of Jaguar, its heart and soul," said Joe Greenwell, Chairman and CEO of Jaguar.

Should the ALC move from concept to reality, then its top speed will probably be limited to

2 5 0 k m h . Many, but not all, European manufacturers are party to a gentleman's agreement restricting the speed of their supercars to the golden 250.

"The ALC is the sort of Jaguar

we want to build," said Mr Greenwell. "But that means we must do much more than just come up with a beautiful design.

We must have the tools in place to turn that creative spark into something more tangible."

The engineering excellence of Jaguar is reflected in the ALC's specifications. An aluminum chassis similar to the XJ saloon is used, which is 40% lighter yet 60% stiffer than a comparable steel body. Lighter weight gives more responsive handling and improved steering feel, as well as better torque reaction.

The interior is classic Jaguar: understated and refined. There is plenty of headroom and an adjustable pedal box, so even tall drivers will feel at home.

"We all agreed that our interiors should be clean, simple and straightforward," said designer Ian Callum. "There's an honesty about the car's interior

that I really like."

Laid out in the classic 2+2

sports-car format, there are front sports and rear bucket seats and tan leather upholstery throughout.

Matt-finished aluminum inserts are spread through the car to accentuate the contemporary feel of the cabin, and in the center of the dash there is a touch-screen Alpine console. The instrument binnacle has been designed to replicate the shape of the steering wheel, while behind the wheel there are paddle-shift levers for the six-speed automatic transmission.

The levers are attached to the steering wheel itself – rather than the steering column – to ensure they are always where a driver expects to find them.


So will the ALC make it into production and, more important, does it herald a strong future for Jaguar?

Jaguar boss Joe Greenwell: "This car is as clear a statement on the strength and confidence of the company as we could possibly make. Its design is assertive and pure and is a perfect symbol of our 21st century cars. Beneath that beautiful body lies the heart and soul of a true Jaguar sports car."

You may draw your own conclusions, but I believe Jaguar could well begin to contribute to PAG's fortunes before very much longer.


# Faith, hope and charity

n the second floor of Central Festival Phuket is a shop that is well worth a visit. So worthwhile is it that a life or – just perhaps – the quality of a life could depend on it.

It is the Life Home Project (LHP) shop, which sells a range of clothes and accessories. Proceeds from sales are plowed back into the LHP's sterling work for mothers and children who are HIV-positive.

ritics often describe a poor performance by an actor as "wooden", but while every performance by Surin Yangkheiosod is "wooden" this is a good thing rather than bad.

K. Surin, 37, is the artistic Director of Natayasala Thai Puppet Theater (formerly the Joe Louis Theatre), which is soon to open a theater in Phuket where, every night, puppeteers will coax emotions from fear to joy from wooden marionettes.

The secret to achieving this, as discovered by K. Surin's father, Sakorn – who, in 1996, was honoured by HM Bhumibol Adulyadej as a National Artist in performing arts for his contribution to preserving traditional Thai puppetry – lies in the total cooperation of the three – yes, three – people who manipulate each marionette.

"My father suggested that the puppeteers should move as their puppet moves, rather than just stand still, with only their hands moving as they control the puppets," said K. Surin.

"We tried it and found that the puppets moved much more smoothly than before.

"But for three people to manipulate a puppet harmoniously, they must, as the saying goes, eat rice from the same

# Knowing how to pull all

When he was 17, **Surin Yangkheiosod** was into motorbike racing and playing drums in a friend's band, and even fighting other teenagers. But by the time he reached 20, he loved puppetry so much that he woke up at 5 am every day, just to practice it in front of a mirror.

Today K. Surin is the Artistic Director of Natayasala Thai Puppet Theater – better known by its former name, the Joe Louis Theatre – which will soon open a theater in Phuket.

The seventh of nine children, and the third generation in his family to master the ancient art, K. Surin here explains to **Gategaeo Phetsawang** how came to love puppetry.

cooking pot. That means there is no difference between them and everyone is equal, wherever they come from. It's a good basis for puppetry."

He added, smiling, "If ever there is a quarrel between the performers, I arrange for them to perform together. Then they have no choice but to resolve the argument, because they can't work together if they are angry."

Also important in puppetry is matching the character of a puppet to the character of a puppeteer.

K. Surin believes that some puppeteers are naturally suited to manipulating certain characters. Some may be best at "playing" the role of Hanuman, the leader of the monkey army in the *Ramakien*, while others are better at playing, say, soldiers in an army.

Others in K. Surin's family – he is the seventh of nine children – have their own interest in *Khone*, or Thai classical masked play. His oldest sister specializes in costumes and accessories; one brother is expert in Thai traditional music, and another in singing Thai traditional songs.

He said, "My brothers and sisters all learned Thai classical

masked play from our father; I started to learn it when I was seven years old.


"I had seen my dad performing *Khone* and Thai musical folk drama. I started acting at a very early age, when my father had me perform as a joker in a play, so I feel familiar with it."

That said, at one stage, it looked like K. Surin would not follow in the family tradition.

He explained, "When I was around 17 years old, I wasn't very interested in *Khone*. I didn't go home, but stayed out with my friends. I was into motorbike racing and playing drums in my friend's band, and even fighting other teenagers. My parents couldn't cope with me.

"But after three years, I decided I couldn't live my life like that anymore, and when a French puppeteer, a friend of my brother, asked me to join his show in France, I went. I spent three months there, demonstrating puppetry in schools.

"I learned about Burmese and Indian puppets. I loved puppetry so much I would wake up at 5 am every day, just to practice it in front of a mirror. That's why it took me about one month

to learn what takes most other people a year."

He continued, "When I returned home, the first thing that struck me was that my father was working, while my brothers were busy with their own businesses.

"I asked myself why my father still had to work when he was 60 years old. Nobody in my family thought I was responsible enough to look after the family.

"I told them that I wanted

to work for my father's puppet troupe, and I started to design the shows. Then we were booked to play in Japan, and it was during this time that my family started to believe in me, and forgot what I had been like in the past.

"I swore to myself that I would buy my dad a new house, and, after spending three months in a monastery, I collected some money from the show and went to Saraburi to work on molding

the 15-meter-high Buddha image there.'

By the time he was 24, K. Surin had earned enough to buy that new house for his father and new instruments for the troupe's musicians.

Now, his career is devoted to preserving and developing Thai puppetry, with his family. He said, "Everyone in the family helps to preserve the theater. I just want to work for the theater. Right now, I teach puppetry, make puppets, am a puppeteer, a driver. In fact, I'll do anything."

The theater has 40 puppets worth at least 40,000 baht apiece, said K. Surin, adding that he spent two years making two special puppets gilded with gold and silver for HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn.

According to K. Surin, small Thai puppets, Hun Lakorn Lek, were invented by Kru Klay

in 1901. As they were 80% mechanical, they could move better than existing puppets. K. Surin's grandparents were puppeteers in Kru Klay's troupe.

Their son, K. Surin's father, Sakorn, became a puppeteer. After a bout of illness, a monk advised K. Sakorn to adopt the nickname Liew – "lucky Chinese

The name became corrupted to Louis, and after legendary boxer Joe Louis visited Thailand, the troupe became known as the Joe Louis Theatre.

Disaster struck in 1999, when a fire destroyed all but two of the company's 50 puppets, along with musical instruments and almost all the family's possessions.


But the family was determined to rebuild and continue to preserve Thailand's puppetting heritage.

Said K. Surin, "I dedicate all the new puppets we create to the Thai people. They belong to everyone; we're just people who preserve them and publicize this aspect of Thai culture for Thais and foreigners alike."

Anyone who wants to learn Thai puppetry, said K. Surin, should know basic Thai classical masked play, traditional dance and/or drama, and have a real desire to learn and love the art.

"We are open for everyone who wants to learn puppetry," he said. "There are now 30 people in our troupe and we're looking for 40 people in Bangkok and 60 people to train so they can work in our theater in Phuket."

He added, "The future of Thai puppetry, which is a national treasure, depends on Thai people. If Thais don't preserve it for future generations, who






#### Taking on the transport mafia

The *Gazette* has long argued for government action to break up the illegal transport monopolies that have done so much to harm the island's tourism industry.

Complaints about the tuk-tuk "mafia", particularly in Patong, have long been the leading gripe among tourists – but they aren't the only ones who have suffered.

The lack of efficient, reasonably-priced public transport – of the kind available in just about every other province of Thailand – has forced many island residents to choose between shouldering the expense of buying a car or risking life and limb on a motorcycle.

Now, with the introduction of 100 new metered taxis and an Airport Bus service scheduled to begin in three months' see News], there appears to be some light at the end of the tunnel.

The announcement couldn't have been better timed. Investment bank Goldman Sachs warned recently that the global oil trade may be entering a demand-driven "superspike" period which could see crude oil prices more than double, to US\$105 barrel.

This possibility, coupled with increasing traffic congestion on our roads, makes the need for a greater range of public transport options more glaringly obvious than ever.

The Airport Bus service to Phuket City is a good start; it should be followed swiftly by a similar service to Patong and Kata-Karon and a free shuttle service around Patong to help ease traffic congestion now that the provincial government is considering regular closure of Soi Bangla to traffic at nights.

The Governor of Phuket has said he is willing to take on "influential figures" to protect the rights of metered taxis to operate as they should be allowed to under the law.

The current downturn in tourism will have cut deep into their expected profits for the first time in years; they will be unlikely to accept any incursion into their domain, and will probably react with their normal tactics: intimidation, violence and vandalism.

Currently, metered taxis in Patong are only "allowed" to pick up fares in front of the Tourist Police office. For the new metered taxis to operate safely will require a very firm commitment on the part of the Kathu Police who, under the command of Superintendent Pol Col Teeraphol Thipjaroen, already have one post-tsunami success under their belt: the successful expulsion of rental bike and jeep operators from their occupation of the beach road.

The Governor and the police deserve full public support for any effort they make to break the stranglehold thuggish elements hold over the island's public transport sector.

## The disabled need better access to sea

These people are often seen looking longingly at the sea, but they have no way of getting to the warm, therapeutic waters because there is no way a wheel-chair could cross the soft sand of the beach. This is the case not only at Kata, but also at other beaches.

We thought he could drive a 4WD vehicle down the slipway and onto the beach, but we have been told that this is illegal. Then we thought he might drive onto the beach on a Quad Bike (a four wheel all-terrain motorcycle) but have been told that it is illegal to drive these on a public road.

Of course, the best solution would be to have a special path to the high-tide level, for use only by the aged and disabled.

We wonder what the legal situation is as regards having a vehicle on the beach to help a disabled person gain access to the sea? We also wonder what steps the Tourism Authority of Thailand is taking to encourage physically impaired and elderly people to visit Phuket and enjoy the sea and the sun like anyone else.

# Under African skies

Rhodesia, Malawi and Zambia

is beautiful, savage and hilarious. Alexandra Fuller's Don't Let's Go to the Dogs Tonight (Random House, New York, 2001, 301pp) is the story of the white African Fuller family comprising Mum (Agatha), Dad (Tim), and daughters Vanessa (Van) and Alexandra (Bobo).

The title might seem a bit odd. It's from a humor-

ous poem by British MP and author AP Herbert titled, Don't let's go to the dogs tonight, for mother will be there.

The phrase has, however, resonance with this book both literally – packs of dogs sleep on the beds and living room furniture of the family's rustic homes – and figuratively; in the aftermath of the bitter civil war in Zimbabwe, when an Australian hitchhiker asks Tim Fuller where he's heading in his Land Rover, he replies, "To the dogs."

On many late nights in clubs around the three countries, Mum and Dad happily go to the dogs too, Mum singing Ole! I'm a bandit! and falling off the bar while

ike Africa itself, this memoir of Van and Bobo wait in the car consoling a girl growing up on farms in themselves with Cokes and potato chips.

But despite the heavy drinking and

Mum's occasional manic-depressive spells, they are a tight family. The parents are rugged white-Kenyan settlers who moved to Rhodesia in 1966 shortly after then-Prime Minister Ian Smith had declared unilateral independence from Britain on November 11, 1965.

Near the Mozambique border - in the most dangerous part of Rhodesia where

insurgents, or "terrs", were constantly moving through the bush to lay landmines and ambush white convoys – the Fullers settled down to grow tobacco and raise cattle on a hardscrabble farm in the remote Burma Valley. Bobo is three, Van six. The house has no electricity and the climate is beastly.

"It's eyeball burning hot. I lie on my belly and let my legs wag lazily back and forth, my head in the crook of my arms where my forehead is pressing a sweaty band into the skin. Mum is reading to herself. It is so hot that the flamboyant tree outside cracks to itself, as it is already anticipating how it will feel to be on fire. ever they can find bare cement, panting and creating wet pools with their dripping tongues. Our throats are papered with the

Dad, like every other white farmer, joins the Rhodesian Army for regular 10day patrols in the bush, hunting down terrs.

With an Uzi slung over her shoulder, Mum runs the farm, plants gardens, patrols the estate on horseback. The two girls grow up to be expert horsewomen and rifle shots, unafraid of snakes, scorpions, jackals and hyenas, while giving wide berth to leopards and baboons. Their only company is each

There are many running jokes in this highly eccentric family – Mum's drunkenness, Dad's temper – but the funniest is Bobo's clinging depen-

dence on Van, the goddess three years her senior who brushes her off with regal disdain. To be a Fuller is to be self-reliant.

Along with the sly humor is an unforced lyricism. Here is the family driving a South African visitor to a lake:

"We pass, without comment or surprise, small rain-ready herds of impala.

The dogs are splayed on the floor wherThe ewes are swollen with impending babies, but the babies will come only with the first rain. Dad stops to let a pair of warthogs charge fatly in front of us, round-bottomed and heads held high. A kudu bull stares us down – the perfect white 'V' on his nose a hunter's target. He is sniffing the air and then, with a magnificent leap, his horns laid across

> his back like medieval weapons, he is gone, plunging grayly into the crosshatched bush.'

> The book is also a family album with 60 photos that track the progress of Bobo and Van from schoolgirls in knee socks to stunningly beautiful brides. In the end, when Mum and Dad are running a prosperous farm in independent Zambia, there's also a subtle change in atti-

Once frankly racist, they invite many Zambian neighbors to the weddings of their daughters, both presided over by Bishop Clement H. Shaba.

This is the best memoir of Africa I've ever read, better than those famous colonial authors Isak Dinesen and Beryl Markham. It's closer to the bone.

# Rights – and wrongs – of software

I uninstalled a legal copy of Office XP from a computer I no longer use. At the time of the original installation I "activated" it online with Microsoft, and as far as I know there is no

way to "de-activate" it online.

Now I want to install this legitimate copy of Office on another

computer. Would I be breaking any rules or laws by doing so? Will Microsoft "know" that it has been installed on a second computer? If so, how?

I am not a lawyer (and I hope never to be one), so this isn't legal advice, but I think what you want to do conforms to Microsoft's expectations, particularly given the rampant copying in Thailand.

The 'Softies know that you

activated that particular copy of Office XP with that specific computer, and there is no such thing as "de-activating". Fortunately, Office XP does not require activation – although Office 2003

> does - and because of that you should feel quite comfortable installing Office XP on a new ma-

chine, and not activating it.

On my Fujitsu laptop I run Windows XP that came with the machine, all legal and with a sticker on the bottom of the laptop. I also have Office XP installed on this laptop, but there is no sticker or any documentation to support that it is genuine. When I launch Microsoft

Again, I'm no lawyer, but if you bought a computer with Office XP pre-installed and the vendor has not responded to your request for confirmation that you have a valid copy, I think you have just two options.

First, you can report the vendor to Microsoft by sending an email to piracy@microsoft. com or by calling Microsoft in Bangkok (see www.microsoft. com/piracy/Reporting\_out.mspx).

Second, you can let things slide. Keep copies and notes about the inquiries you've made to the vendor, and copies of any

receipts you may have for software. That way, if the gendarmes ever knock on your door, you can readily pass the buck.

I have spent hours trying to find guidance on "read only file" in one of your Dummies books. I burned a file to CD and then wanted to revise it, but couldn't. How did I make it a "read only" file, and how can I delete or modify or revise it?

When you burn a file to CD, Windows automatically marks it as read only, which means you can read files on the CD, but can't change them unless you re-write the entire CD.

When you copy the file from the CD onto a hard drive, it's still marked read only, because the original file – the one on the CD - was marked read only. Doesn't make sense, but that's how it works.

If you've copied the file from the CD to a hard drive, and you want to change the file, first find the file using, say, Start | My Documents or whatever you like. Right-click on the file and choose Properties. Down at the bottom you'll see a box under "Attributes" that says "Read only". Uncheck that box, click OK, and you'll be able to edit to your heart's content.

# The legacy of the deep

ili Back, the Operations Manager of the Koh Tao Dive Operators Club (KT-DOC), is vibrant with energy. The only paid employee of KT-DOC, 27-year-old Gili is an exotic mix of ancestry and influence.

Raised in the Republic of South Africa by Jewish parents, Gili migrated to Israel with her family when she was 11, then lived in England for five years before moving to Thailand two years ago.

"The KT-DOC was organized in 2003 by the majority of the owners and managers of dive businesses who wanted

to stop the wheeling and dealing going on around the island," she explained.

"One of the main influences

in the formation of the KT-DOC was a Japanese lady by the name of Sharlyn Sawasa, a diving instructor who lived on the island for 12 years.

"Unfortunately, she recently passed away, but it is her vision that guides the organization today. She pushed hard for the preservation of the environment and the sustainable development of Koh Tao from the first day she stepped on the island.

"She's one of the reasons

why I'm doing this job. Somebody has to continue the work that she started. I think Sharlyn realized early on how necessary and impor-

tant it was to preserve Koh Tao. When she saw that the diving industry was growing as more people came, she realized that the



impact on the environment could be adverse."

The first project of the KT-DOC was the Koh Tao Underwater World Day, on February 7 last year.

The club's President, Vijite Srisung, explained that the plan is to make it an annual event to mark the opening of the official diving season on Koh Tao. On February 12 this year KT-DOC put Koh Tao on the diving map by breaking the world record for the largest number of divers diving simultaneously.

Gili explained, "We decided to come up with a gimmick that would attract tourists not only to come to Thailand, but also to have some activities that they could actually take part in, instead of just standing on the side observing.

"I am from Durban in South Africa, and I knew about the previous record set there three years ago so we decided that we were going to break it. Officially, we had 722 people in the water, though we actually had 750 divers because not everybody signed registration forms."

The record-breaking dive attracted some criticism from environmental organizations but, in its defense, Gili explained, "First of all, we invited the World Wildlife Federation to monitor the event. We had actually invited them before we came up with the record-breaking idea.

"Second, Guinness had strict environmental guidelines that we had to comply with, so the attempt was planned and coordinated so that the dive was performed, not on a coral reef but on a sandy bottom eight to 10 meters deep."

The safety of the divers was another major concern. "We had oxygen boats, evacuation boats, spotters and marker buoys. So both the safety and the environmental issues were at the top of the priority list in planning an event of this magnitude."

Gili believes the event was a success. "I think most of the

participants enjoyed themselves, after all, it is not everyone who can claim, 'Hey, I am a record breaker'," she said.

But the record-breaking dive was not the only activity. "We had a beauty pageant to select Miss Koh Tao and Mr Koh Tao, which turned out to be hilarious.

"Surat Thani Governor Juthamas Siriwan came to the event, which started with monks blessing the island.

"Everyone enjoyed the festivities. There was something for everybody," Gili said.

In addition to the fun stuff, the KT-DOC has some more serious projects lined up for this year, including:

- The sinking of an old landing craft and a B-29 bomber to provide underwater attractions;
- Revamping all moorings and access areas on dive sites;
- Installing caged propellers on all dive boats operating from Koh Tao;
- Setting up a turtle breeding and release program;
- Educating every dive shop employee and the community to help preserve the beauty


of underwater sites in the area;

- Creation of an artificial reef;
- Teaching schoolchildren to swim, snorkel and dive, and educating them about marine life;
- Launching a battery disposal and collection project;
- Conducting marine research, including species counts, research on water changes, building fishing grounds to help the fisherman population while saving the reefs.
- Launching a giant clam release project;
- Breaking another record by staging the longest and biggest reef check, in coordination with CPAD, a Thai-American environmental group that will set up an office on Koh Tao.

"Oh, we have already sunk the first tuk-tuk here in Koh Tao as part of the festival we have just concluded," Gili added.

"It's a 'pay for' training dive site, and the money collected will go toward teaching children to dive. If you teach children how to dive, you also teach them to appreciate and preserve the environment.

"This is the legacy of Sharlyn Sawasa. Her vision is being

PHUKET CITY: The recent Architect Taksin '05 exhibition, from April 1 to 3, attracted good crowds to check out the products and services on offer at the booths of some 40 companies that set up exhibitions in the Royal Phuket City Hotel.

The organizers, the Association of Siamese Architects under Royal Patronage (ASA) and TTF International Co, said that they were already discussing holding another such exhibition next year.

"But then the tsunami came and we put our plans on hold. However, we soon realized that, with many buildings damaged by the waves, it would be good to help revive and renovate the region, so we resurrected the show"

He added, "We have had good feedback from the visitors.

Many of them are in the construction business or are engineers, though there are also members of the general public who are interested in decorative and construction materials."

One visitor, Prasit Pong-Udom, said, "I am interested in sanitary fittings, ceramic tiles and so on. My favorite booth is the Kohler (Thailand) one – the products are very attractively designed.


"Other booths I like are Green Furniture and Green Living Home Co. If they hold another exhibition like this, I'll go to it."

# Airport

he first phase of a twopart extension to Phuket International Airport – a new two-story international terminal – is due to be completed in May, five months later than originally planned.

Airport Director Maj Pornchai Eua-aree told the Gazette the project had been delayed because local suppliers had refused to supply the contractor with building materials on credit, and this had caused "a lack of liquidity".

However, said Maj Pornchai, work had continued and the project is now more than twothirds complete.

He explained, "Construction started in the middle of last year, and we expected it to be finished by the end of the year.

"However, the contractor did not have any contacts in Phuket, and suppliers demanded that he pay cash, and this caused a lack of liquidity.

"But now, construction is 70% complete, and we expect this phase to be finished in May."

In addition to increasing interior space by 1,500 square meters, the extension will add a bridge, an escalator, and checkin counters and other facilties.

The project cost will be 150 million baht, and it is being paid for by the Airports Authority of Thailand (AAT).

The two-stage expansion was planned because of the growth in international arrivals, but Maj Pornchai said phase two has been put on hold.

He noted that in the last quarter of 2004, the number of international passengers increased by 30.8% compared with the same quarter of 2003, but in the first quarter of 2005, following the tsunami, the number had slumped by 25.4% when compared with the first quarter of

He said AAT wanted to wait and see whether passenger

traffic would rebound and increase as earlier projected before committing to the estimated 400-million-baht investment the new extension would require.

"We were due to start work

on the second phase in 2006, but that has now been postponed. It looks as though it will be 2007 before we look at restarting the construction program."

He continued, "The figures

show that the international terminal here dealt with 2.1 million passengers last year. If both these projects were completed, we would have the capacity for three million passengers a year."







Gardening with Bloomin' Bert

here are too many experts, too many people who think they know what they're talking about but actually haven't the faintest idea.

Most members of this particularly annoying species of human tend to hang around in bars, waxing lyrical on subjects in which they're complete amateurs, though they would like their fellow drinkers to think otherwise.

They'll try to give you advice on which car you should buy without having driven anything but an Isuzu pickup for the last five years. That kind of thing.

Then there are the 'professional' experts. These are the founts of wisdom who are drafted into situations such as criminal courts, to give their considered opinion on the subject at hand.

It strikes me as a little odd that both the defense and prosecution attorneys can produce experts who say the complete opposite from each other. I rest my case.

Expert gardeners also tend to be a complete pain in the proverbial. Many of them haven't a clue, and much of the advice they offer reflects this. You often want to tell them exactly what they should do with their trowels.

I'm happy to admit that I simply haven't a clue most of the time. People often ask me to identify plants. If you don't know, you don't know – there's just no way

# Any time is ti time

around that. But I have learned a bit of a cheat over the years, which can sometimes make you sound as if you know what you're talking about.

If someone comes up to you and describes a plant with no flowers, and lots of regular-shaped leaves that appear from a single stem, then the simple answer is that it is – probably – a ti plant, or cordyline. *Maak-phu-maak-mia* is one of the variants in Thai.

The ti is a bit of an oddity. What does it look like? It would be so easy to give a quick simple description of the ti plant – if there was one. It has leaves, which are usually glossy. Sometimes they're green, but usually not; the colors can be spectacularly vivid, from green to bright pink, and just about everything in-between.

Sometimes these leaves are long and slender, but often not. Occasionally it has flowers, but usually it doesn't bother.

Just about the only rule is that the stem seems to extend from the growth of new leaves, a bit like some palm trees. Even placement isn't that easy – some varieties like full sun, while others prefer the shade.



DEFYING DESCRIPTION: Some green, some red; whether with long and slender leaves or not, the ti plant can be difficult to describe.

The first wild ti plants, with their original green leaves, came from the islands of Polynesia. There, the locals made their traditional skirts from the leaves, because they don't shrivel when they dry up. At some stage, somebody thought it would be a good idea to start experimenting with the ti, and soon variants were exported all over the world.

It now features in just about

every garden in Phuket, in one form or another, though you might not know it. It's often seen as an ornamental plant, as it grows very predictably – that is, straight up. At least, it tries to.

Often, it gets so tall that it bends sideways under its own weight. Once this happens, the new growth at the end of the stalk then makes a dramatic turn skywards.

You can produce some bizarre-looking versions of the tiplant by letting it do this, or even encouraging it by pulling it over, then propping it up vertically again. The direction change will happen every time and the result will look particularly abnormal.

You'll no doubt have a plant with somewhat severe psycho-

logical problems, but at least it will look cool.

Propagation is best achieved by the good old "cut it and stick it" method. Simply cut the stem at any point you wish, remove a few of the lower leaves and push the stem a few inches into some potting compost.


The offcut will mope for a while, and drop a few more of the lower leaves. After a week or two, and with liberal doses of water, it will start to liven up and become a plant in its own right, quietly sprouting roots with very little help.


The ti plant actually seems to enjoy having its stems hacked off. Within a few days of being attacked, it will eagerly sprout two or three more stems to replace any it lost. After a few months this process can be repeated, so that from one solitary stem you can potentially produce many more.

Even better, the bits that were removed are now climbing skyward in their own right, starting the process all over again.

The ti plant will always look impressive. Just don't try to ask for one at the local garden center, or give advice about it, however "expert" you may be: it is too difficult to pigeonhole.






