HUGE REEF DISCOVERED

Four square kilometers of coral 'unique in Thailand'

PHANG NGA: Marine scientists inspecting coral reefs along the Andaman coast have discovered an uncharted reef off Tai Muang covering, they say, at least four square kilometers – larger than any known reef in the region.

The discovery, made in the first week of January, was documented by Songpol Tippayawong, Head of the Thailand Marine and Coastal Conservation Unit (MCCU) of the WWF (formerly known as the World Wildlife Fund). The MCCU were surveying a reef nearby when they were tipped off by local fisher-

"We never thought the reef would be so large," said K. Songpol, a Phang Nga native.

"I have never even seen a reef that is one kilometer wide by one kilometer long in Thailand, and so far we have surveyed only four square kilometers of this new reef. It is actually bigger, we have yet to survey the exact boundaries."

The discovery follows a report in January this year that about 13% of reefs inspected along the Andaman coast in the weeks after the tsunami had 50% or more of their coral destroyed by the waves.

Describing the reef, K. Songpol told the Gazette, "It was great – very big and healthy. It is in good condition and only about 1% of it was damaged by the tsu-

from the [reefs at] the Similans, Surin or Richelieu – it is not sloping, and it is home to species never before seen in Thai waters as well as species [that before were] only seen in the Similans, such as a rare type of sweet lips.

"We also found one rock formation with over 20 lobsters in it. We named that site 'lobster condo'," he said.

Although the MCCU has yet to complete its assessment of the reef, the team has so far recorded more than 30 genera of hard corals, 112 species of fish from 56 families, including the parrot fish Chlorurus rakaura, which has never been seen in Thai waters before.

K. Songpol, who has worked at the Phuket Marine Biological Center at Cape Panwa for the past eight years, explained that tin mining in the area was the likely reason that the reef remained undiscovered

"I think that because of the tin mining many years ago, people assumed that coral this area

would have been degraded [be-

cause of the run-off from the mining]," he said. For now, K. Songpol is

keeping the location of the reef a secret in order to protect it. "Right now I'm not telling any one exactly where it is," he said, adding that the reef must first be surveyed, the coral's condition assessed and the boundaries of the reef established.

Suwat pushes for fast action on Phi Phi

PHUKET: In an abrupt government about-face after more than a year of blocking rehabilitation of Koh Phi Phi Don following the tsunami, Deputy Prime Minister Suwat Liptapanlop has urged redevelopment be pushed ahead to hasten the island's return to its former status as a tourism hot-

At a meeting held at the Royal Phuket City Hotel, government representatives from Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi discussed redevelopment progress in the three provinces.

'DISGRACEFUL'

Krabi Vice-Governor Chai Panichpornpan complained that construction has been started on only three of the planned 50 houses for tsunami victims on Koh Phi Phi Don.

V/Gov Chai said, "Can you imagine this – that tourists can approach to within sight of Koh Phi Phi Don, yet they cannot disembark due to boat congestion in the bay? It's disgraceful that redevelopment plans still have not been approved."

He also commented on two key problems the island faces: supplies of water and power.

Thailand's Provincial Waterworks Authority has agreed to produce water using reverse osmosis technology to sell to Phi Phi Don residents, depending on government funding for the

Despite a 620-million-baht budget approved on September 6 last year by the Provincial Electricity Authority to link the island to the mainland power grid via be the Thai Rak Thai (TRT) party

underwater cables, the Environmental Office (EO) – under the the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment - has not authorized this project, claiming that the necessary construction work would destroy or damage surrounding coral reefs.

Currently, people on the island use generators to produce

Deputy PM Suwat asked,

'Why doesn't the EO care about the noise pollution caused by the generators?"

Officials from the EO agreed to reconsider allowing cables to be laid underwater if Krabi Province sends them a revised Initial Environmental Examination (IEE).

The project IEE is now undergoing a review, for resubmission to the EO.

Finally, V/Gov Chai said that although locals agree to a 20-meter-wide strip of shoreline to be designated a no-construction zone in order to preserve the beachfront, the Land Department and the EO have already approved a 30m-wide zone, causing anger among some island residents.

He added that, with the tourism season in full swing, hotels and other tourism businesses were irked because no development of land by the beach can start until the dispute is resolved.

Deputy PM Suwat ordered the Vice-Governor, the Land Department and the EO to discuss the issue further and reach a final decision. However, no deadline was set.

Phuket gears up for polls

PHUKET: Voters in Phuket and across the country will be busy in April with two national elections: the Parliamentary election slated for April 2 and the Senatorial election on April 19.

Dr Sriyada Palimapan will

candidate for Phuket's Parliamentary District 1 while Wisut Santikul stand for District 2.


Whether the Democrats who held both seats in Phuket until Parliament was dissolved – will field candidates is not clear.

The Democrats, the Mahachon Party and the Chart Thai Party have decided to boycott the April 2 election as part of the growing drive to force Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra to resign.

Candidates for election to Parliament must register between March 4 and 8.

Candidates for the Senatorial race must register between March 24 and 28.

The unofficial list of senatorial candidates for Phuket now includes: Dr Prasit Koeysiripong, Thanyarat Achariyachai, Prawat Suwannadithakul and Uthai Suksirisamphan.

area [but only] when there is a good management plan. We are doing a field survey and we are collecting scientific data in order to zone the area and put down some mooring buoys."

K. Songpol expressed concern that enforcement of environmental conservation laws was lacking, which might jeopardize the reef. "There are a lot of good laws in Thailand, but enforcement needs to be more effective."

He explained that a management strategy was crucial to protecting the reef. The strategy should include: raising awareness among local people; zoning and the reintroduction of some rare species of marine life; promoting tourism, with participation from local villagers; and continual coral restoration. "We have already introduced 100 giant clams [at the new reef]," he said.

With a good management strategy in place, K. Songpol did not see see tourism and diving as a threat to the reef, "...not if we have regulations like the United Nations Environment Program's (UNEP) Green Fins [guidelines] and a code of conduct. We can control the carrying capacity [the number of divers diving on the reef] and set some regulations," he said.

"Dive operators love nature and are willing to help in all kinds of conservation activities," he added. "I also understand they have to make a profit. But we need to get all interested parties involved in managing natural resources.

"We cannot do it ourselves

or with just one or two government bodies. Without participation from local people, dive operators and tour operators, we won't have an effective management strategy," he said.
For the dive communities in

Phuket and Khao Lak, the discovery came as both a bombshell and a cause for joy. Jeroen Deknatel, managing Director of Fantasea Divers, told the *Gazette*, "I'm absolutely delighted. Any new dive site means that it takes the pressure off existing dive sites. It's also great news for the Khao Lak diving community, who have been hard-hit. It's a special gift for them."

However, like K. Songpol, he also made a plea for the newly-discovered reef to be treated with due care to ensure that it is not damaged. The greatest amount of damage done to reefs these days, he said, was by inexperienced divers.

"Let's do what they do in Malaysia and keep inexperienced divers away from all that brittle coral until they have developed the underwater skills that ensure that they don't accidentally bump into things and break things off." This would have to be policed by the dive companies themselves, he added.

In Khao Lak, initial reaction has also been excited. "We know only what we have seen from the announcement by the WWF," said Wolly Woermer of Subaqua Club. "So far there have been no details about the location and depth of the coral.

"But we are excited about the new reef, as it may offer new options for diving daytrips from

Plan to relax license rules for yacht skippers

BANGKOK: The Ministry of Tourism and are under 16 meters (52 feet) in length. The French expertise in marina management, it Sports (MoTS) is planning to put before Cabinet a proposal to allow people with foreign captain's licenses to skipper Thai-registered sailing vachts.

The proposal, intended to give a boost to the marine tourism industry, would do away with an existing regulation that requires foreign skippers wanting to sail boats in local waters to obtain Thai licenses from the Marine Department.

It would also open up the market for bareboat charters. At present, any foreigner who charters a boat in Thailand, and who does not have a Thai license himself, must also hire a skipper with a Thai license.

The new regulation, if approved, would apply only to Thai-registered sailboats that boats must also have motors of a limited size. added.

The move follows a joint declaration entitled "The Plan of Action of Franco-Thai Tourism Cooperation", signed on February 18 by Thai Tourism and Sports Minister Pracha Maleenont and his French counterpart, Leon

The declaration was one of a number of initiatives agreed to during a three-day state visit by French President Jacques Chirac.

According to a press release by the MoTS, those who stand to benefit most from the relaxed restrictions would be internationalstandard marinas, of which, it said, there are four in Thailand – two in Phuket and two in Chon Buri. The agreement would also help the marine industry to grow further by using

Bunjird Sonsuwan, Section Manager of the Tourism and Sports Ministry's Public Relations office, told the Gazette that if there are no political changes and if the proposal is approved by Cabinet, it would go into effect on October 1.

Not everyone is happy with the proposed rule change. Surin Tirakulpisut, Head of the Phuket Marine Office, questioned how Thailand would benefit from a relaxation in regulations that he believes are already fair.

"How many people sail in here on big yachts and don't stay in our hotels? These people are rich – they're millionaires. But I don't see how Thai people benefit from them coming here," he said.

Seaweed causes a stink in Patong

PATONG: Nipawan Bussarawit, a marine biologist at the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC), has confirmed that the rising level of "organic contaminants" in Patong Bay has contributed to the explosive growth of stinking brown seaweed that has been washing up on Patong Baech for the past month.

K. Nipawan said that the water quality in Patong Bay was still at acceptable levels, but the rise in its organic content may have spurred the growth of the seaweed, which she identified as being Cladophora.

"Cladophora grows naturally, but the factors that cause this seaweed to bloom so much like this are high levels of nutrients and high temperatures.

"The high organic content comes from wastewater. If we had a good wastewater treatment system, the water going into the bay shouldn't have organic waste - or inorganic waste - that would cause the seaweed to grow." K. Nipawan added that the weed is not harmful to people.

Patong Deputy Mayor Chairat Sukkabaan defended Municipality efforts to deal with the problem. "We send workers to clean up the weed every day, and test the water quality every week.

"The water quality is not that bad, and even the PMBC has told us that the seaweed grows not just because of the organic material but also from the weak current and the amount of sunshine – and it's not harmful."

Tsunami tower test causes consternation

PHUKET: Officials declared a test of 12 tsunami warning towers on February 22 a success, but residents of some parts of the island said they were terrified as they had received no warning of the trial, during which full emergency messages were broadcast.

One woman living in Chalong said, "The warning tower kept broadcasting a message telling us to get out and run for higher ground. Cars were roaring up the hill past our house. It was very frightening."

"In the end, I called my husband and he told me that it was just a drill," she said.

The Gazette was at Saphan Hin for the test there, during which the broadcast message, in English, was, "Attention please! Attention please! There are tidal waves from storm winds. Please leave the beach as far as possible for higher ground urgently."

The Mandarin version mentioned a "typhoon".

Arun Keodsom, Chief of the Phuket Office for Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (ODPM), apologized to those who were frightened by the test.

"I want to apologize to people [who were panicked]. We informed the tambon administration organizations, the district offices, the Phuket Provincial Public Relations Office, and the press

and TV stations about the test," he said.

"I told the NDWC [the National Disaster Warning Center in Nonthaburi] to broadcast 'This is a drill' at the beginning of each warning. But they didn't do that. They broadcast that message just once, right at the beginning of the test," he added.

That apart, he said, the test was a success. "We tested all 12 warning towers. The trial was satisfactory."

In addition to the 12 tested on February 22, four more warning towers are in various stages of construc-

Vice-Governor Worapot Ratthasima told the Gazette that the tower on Koh Lone, off Chalong, is ready, but has not yet been linked to the NDWC.

Two more towers are to be built at Nai Harn and Kata Noi, funded by donations from Thai TV channel iTV. They are expected to be completed in March.

"Recently, Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura went to Koh Racha," V/Gov Worapot said. "He observed that this is a tsunami danger area and assigned me to contact iTV to request funding for one more tower."

K. Arun said that the budget has already been approved by iTV and the tower will be completed in April.

Employers threaten strike over labor crackdown

PHUKET CITY: Some 200 angry employers descended on Phuket Provincial Meeting Hall on February 27, threatening to go on strike if their demands for an easing of rules on foreign laborers are not met.

Key representatives of the Phuket Provincial Fisheries Association, the Phuket Provincial Construction Association and other Phuket businesses handed Phuket Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura a petition urging him to reduce the fines imposed on employers caught hiring illegal laborers from Myanmar, Laos and Cambodia.

They made three demands:

- An amnesty allowing employers not to register laborers until a new government has been installed.
- A freeze on the compulsory 1,000-baht-per-laborer good behavior bond until Memoranda of Understanding that the Thaksin administration was in the process of completing with Myanmar, Laos and Cambodia have been signed.
- An end to arrests of employers and illegal laborers in cases where an extension to pay the registration fee has been granted by the Phuket Provincial **Employment Services Office** (PESO).

If these demands were not met, the petition stated, all employers who have signed the petition would suspend all work.

The following day, at a meeting chaired by the Governor, it was decided to accede to the employers' third point, though K. Boonchock warned afterwards, "If [unregistered] laborers are found wandering at large, the police can [still] arrest them."

As for the first two points, he said that these had been relayed to the Ministry of Labor in Bangkok, which is considering them.



t a February 22 meeting chaired by Deputy Prime Minister Suwat Liptapanlop at the Royal Phuket City Hotel, only about half of the Patong Bay Development committee's 36 members – all appointed by embattled Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra – bothered to attend.

Just days before the dissolution of Thailand's lower house, Deputy Prime Minister Suwat Liptapanlop chaired a meeting on the long-discussed Phuket Bay (Ao Phuket) Development mega-project, which would transform the city's drab seafront into the gateway for a futuristic international convention hall and marina complex, which, its proponents say, would serve as an icon for Thailand. total project cost at a staggering 63.5 billion baht, with the government making an initial 4.9-billionbaht investment in infrastructure.

According to the 2003 study, the break-even point would be three years and the pay-backperiod as short as 13 years, assuming optimal conditions. The basic internal rate on return would be 8.64 % a year; 10.77% under optimal conditions. The net present value over 30 years would increase more than 10-fold, from 2.8 billion baht to over 24.5 billion baht. The offshore complex would require 14,300 cubic meters of water per day, while daily producing 5,805 cubic meters of wastewater and 45 tonnes of trash and garbage, the study said.

Gov Udomsak said the state-owned waterfront land required for the project is currently tied up in a tin-mining concession held by Tongkah Harbour Pcl, but that will expire at the end of this

Gov Udomsak revealed the names of four groups interested in investing in the project: Tongkah Harbour; an investment company controlled by Thai investor Premchai Kannasut; an unnamed Canadian firm and a Japanese

firm understood to be that of renowned University of Tokyo Professor Tadao Umezawa and his firm Umezawa and Partners.

This Umezawa group has already produced a detailed manual and CD overview describing its vision of a project, which would start with a resort called "Anabasis", to be "based on the supposition that a spaceship has traveled through space and time and landed in Phuket

When finished the project would also include a "media wall"; the world's largest video display screen, measuring 90 x 180 square meters, which would dominate the skyline like a scene out of *Bladerunner* with images visible from Phuket City.

onspicuously absent from the February 22 proceedings was OrBorJor President Anchalee Vanich-Thepabutr, whose agency was represented by her deputy, Sutin Uthaitamrong. He told the committee that the project stood to benefit the country and province as well as bring jobs to local people.

"However, Phuket residents do not want the project to consist of gambling and entertainment venues, such as bars and pubs," he said.

She also expressed concerns about the project's effect on traffic and its environmental impacts; according to the feasibility study, all of the garbage generated would need to be burned by the municipal incinerator at Saphan Hin that is already working well over its capacity, she concluded.

Although there have never been any public hearings about the project – nor are any planned – DPM Suwat concluded that the viewpoints of those committee members who bothered to attend seemed to constitute public support for the project, which he described as being still "at the groundwork stage".


The DPM downplayed the possibility of adverse environmental effects from the project, such as damage to the remaining tracts of mangrove forest that once flourished in the area, and damage to marine life though sedimentation.

generate income through tourism," he said.

In what was seen as a reference to the Petronas Towers in Kuala Lampur, DPM Suwat decried Thailand's lack of a modern, world-class icon to promote tourism.

"Thailand doesn't have any tourism landmarks. Apart from structures built by our ancestors, most of our tourist attractions are natural, not man-made. Malaysia doesn't compare with Thailand in terms of natural beauty, but now they have become our big com-

petitors by using innovative ideas to make their country interesting," he said.

DPM Suwat was also clearly impressed during his visit to the United Arab Emirates city of Dubai, where an internationally acclaimed resort and a huge property development have been built on reclaimed land in the shape of a palm tree. This project is so huge that it is clearly visible in satellite images taken.

Now Dubai investors are going even further, investing US\$3 billion (120 billion baht) to

build 300 man-made islands which, combined, will take on the shape of a world map.

According to DPM Suwat, Thai tourism needs a similar focal point – and it should be located in the muddy waters of Phuket Bay, into which

flows much of the untreated wastewater from Phuket City and its environs, including parts of Kathu.

"Phuket can do it, but we will need to improve our infrastructure, such as by expanding the airport to accommodate more and larger aircraft as well as in improving the waste management system," he said.

DPM Suwat summed up the way forward for transforming Phuket Bay from eyesore to icon as follows:

• Overcoming legal hurdles,

such as by getting special approval for the work despite existing regulations that forbid backfilling of the sea. Such permission can be granted if the work is viewed as being "in the public interest", he said.

• Guiding the course of the development in such a way as to ensure that appropriate facilities are provided, while still allowing enough flexibility to investors. MICE facilities (with seating for a minimum 10,000 delegates) and a marina would need to be part of any development plan, he said.

• Clear investment guidelines and incentives would have to be put in place, such as by allowing investment on land concession for an appropriate length of time, such as 30 or 60 years. This would require further study, he said.

"This project is suitable and the local people agree with it," he said, adding that no project can succeed without the support of locals.

To this end, a 12-member panel, headed by Gov Udomsak, was formed to handle public relations, which will include informing the public about the project through local government bodies and relaying public concerns to the main committee. Again, there was no specific call to arrange local public hearings listed in the sub-committee's mandate.

Another progress meeting on the issue would be held in two weeks' time, said DPM Suwat, "but I think it's better if we hold it in Bangkok," he added.

Thanan Tanpaibul, whose company holds a 30-year concession to operate Rassada Harbor at the north end of Phuket Bay near the mouth to Klong Tha Chin, attended an earlier meeting on the project organized by BBMT Consultants. He said he is in favor of the project, as it could help develop the entire Phuket City waterfront.

"If a huge project such as

this can help organize housing and environmental control systems, it will improve the area," he said.

However, he stressed that the development would have to be carried out in strict accordance with the terms of the project's Environmental Impact Assessment.

He added that the government's limited budget and limited experience of projects of this scale and nature made seeking private investment and expertise the preferred option.

But that might not be easy. "In my opinion, it's going to be difficult because investors want a clear idea of when they will see a return on investment, and that's not so easy to provide," he said.

A lso in favor of the project is Phuket Chamber of Commerce President Eam Thavornwongwongse, who is a member of both the main Phuket Bay Development committee and the public relations sub-committee.

He sees the project as having the potential to give a new direction to tourism development on the island – one that could help change the seasonal nature of the Phuket tourism industry by attracting visitors year-round.

K. Eam said the only scenario under which the project is likely to happen in the foreseeable future is through massive private sector investment. Like K. Thanan, he thinks that, to make this possible, the government must make the investment terms clear and attractive.

Like most of the people the *Gazette* spoke to, K. Eam sees the environmental impact of the project as a secondary concern.

"If we get investment in this area it might even help conserve the environment...there is no need to worry about the effects of backfilling the sea floor as this type of thing has already been done in Penang and Singapore," he noted.



Suspect shampoos come up clean

ests by the Food and Drug Administration found nothing wrong with samples of a leading anti-dandruff shampoo that two people claimed made them go bald.

FDA director Dr Paijit Varachit said the FDA's Medical Sciences Department tested two samples and found the ingredients used were in accordance with what was on the labels and that there was no contamination.

One of the two samples tested was taken from a bottle bought in Samut Prakan by Samran Saipromyat, who complained that he lost most of his hair within weeks after using the shampoo. The other was from a bottle bought from a convenience store in Kamphaeng Phet Province by Ploy Sampao, aunt of well-known singer Netchanok Panpure, who claimed the shampoo had an odd smell and that there was a condom inside its container.

In the case of K. Ploy, who said she went bald after using the same shampoo three times, doctors found she suffered from a skin disease called alopecia areata, which causes hair loss.

FDA Secretary-General Pakdee Pothisiri said he would advise doctors to check if Samran's hair loss had been caused by a skin disease.

K. Pakdee has asked provincial health offices countrywide to inspect shampoos sold at cheap prices at fairs.

If sellers were found carrying fake shampoos or failed to identify where they were made,

they would face charges. The FDA plans a public campaign to educate people about shampoo allergies, he said.

Blaze of gory: Chon Buri fireworks manufacturer Phithak Yajanthra suffered severe burns and died at a local hospital after two packages of fireworks he was lifting onto a pickup truck exploded.

The blast threw him 10 meters from the vehicle. Debris from his home, which housed the fireworks plant and also ignited, was found 100 meters away.

Phithak's wife Chanida said her husband had been in the business for 10 years and had spent all of that day making fireworks for an international conference in Chon Buri Province.

Wild accusations: Supoj Methapiwat, the director of the Chiang Mai Night Safari's Animal Management Office, defended the park in the face of allegations by foreign animal-rights activists that many animals had died there because its staff was inadequately trained to care for the animals.

K. Supoj said the activists

had failed to mention that dozens of animals had been born at the night safari, including lions and a number of species of deer.

"Is this a result of good care, then?" he asked sarcastically.

Smackdown: Lin Po Ching of Taiwan and Malaysian Yang Chien Ting were arrested by antinarcotics officers at the departure terminal of Bangkok's Don Muang Airport while checking in to board a flight to Taiwan with heroin packs attached to their legs and bodies. Police earlier arrested Choe Wan Hoi, of Ma-

laysia, who allegedly supplied the drug to both "mules".

Choe lived in a Bangkok apartment, where he supplied the heroin and "dressed" the two other suspects with the drug before they flew to Taiwan. The three have been charged with possessing heroin and attempting to traffick it.

Police Maj Gen Suwat Janitthikul, a deputy chief of the Royal Thai Police's Narcotics Suppression Bureau (NSB), said the arrests resulted from intelligence cooperation with Taiwanese police. The suspects had smuggled heroin from Thailand to Taiwan before, he said.

Water policy runs uphill: The former Director-General of the Royal Irrigation Department said he thought experts from abroad lack the necessary geographical, climatic or social understanding to be able to allocate Thai water resources appropriately.

Speaking at a public forum organized by the National Economic and Social Development Advisory Council, Senator Pramote Maiklad said he feared the previous Thaksin administration's policy of inviting foreign companies to play a crucial role in water management would waste time and money.

Sen Pramote suggested the government should embark on a national study of all the factors relating to water and its supply.

The crack of doom

PATHUM THANI: Readers living in Thailand may occasionally experience the frustration of having to deal with a sudden infestation of red ants, roaches, or termites. What can be more annoying than discovering that savory breast of barbecued chicken you left on the table moments ago is swarming with feisty red ants?

Discovering your house swarming with glistening, newly hatched cobras, that's what!

Residents of Baan Suan Laem Tong, a suburb to the north of Bangkok in Pathum Thani's Tambon Klong Neung, have been confronted with that rather frightening situation, and, finding themselves at a loss how to deal with the problem, called on the government for help. Government experts, however, told them merely to put on knee boots and get out their brooms.

As is well-known, cobras are an especially dangerous family of snakes: their poison acts not on the blood, but on the central nervous system – so is more swiftly mortal unless a large shot of anitvenin is given immediately.

The denizens of Baan Suan Laem Tong probably never guessed they would have to worry about the proximity of antivenins when purchasing their homes.

"For the first three months I lived here, life was normal," said Tanongsak Jantsaneh, 28, "but on February 20 baby cobras about the thickness of my thumb emerged from a crack in the road beside by house. I called the neighbors and together we beat them to death. But the cobras kept coming out of the crack in the road. We killed nearly 20, and had to take turns sitting up at night on the look-out for more.

"The next morning, we broke into an old fish-farm tank next to our homes and found it seething with baby cobras. We killed at least another 20. After that I sealed up the crack in the road outside my house – but the snakes found another crack in the house next door, and started coming out of it. So residents have had to seal every crack in and around their houses."

Another resident, Jom Nualjant, explained that the crack in the street runs about the length of three houses: "We've been hitting at snakes that emerge all along the crack. I found a spot next to one house where the concrete opened up to about the length of your hand – from the earth subsiding – and bent down to look inside: I saw a pile of snake eggs.

"So I reached in and scraped up a handful; but suddenly the mother cobra showed herself. She reared up and spread her hood, which was about the width of an adult's palm. It was pretty scary. I called the neighbors and we closed the crack with cement. But no matter how many cracks

we seal up, the snakes always find new ones from which to escape."

The night of February 22, K. Jom and his neighbors caught and killed another seven cobras.

"It's dangerous," he said, "we have to carry sticks around all the time. I'm afraid one of the children, or even an adult, will get hurt. In just three nights we've killed at least 50 snakes."

K. Jom said he thinks earth beneath the housing estate is honeycombed with hollows: "That makes the cobras want to go in and lay their eggs."

Residents say they have complained to officials that the situation is "a threat to life and limb," which is true, and asked for help. They probably find the methods suggested so far somewhat disappointing.

According to government veterinarian Dr Alongkorn Mahannop, they should spread kerosene or other strong smelling chemicals around their homes: "They need to pour it out all over the place; it'll drive the snakes into the forest or other place where there are no people, because they don't like the smell."

Alternatively, he suggested they might want to catch the snakes "and then release them in the national park."

A snake expert with the Thai Red Cross Council said the cobras were indeed attracted to moist hollows beneath the earth, and explained they typically lay seven to 30 eggs at a time: "After that they abandon their nests, leaving the eggs to hatch about two months later.

"Residents needn't fear the mother snake will guard the nest. Cobras don't care about their offspring." That statement, however, is not in consonance with the experience of Baan Suan Laem Tong resident K. Jom, as related above, and also diverges from the opinion of some Western snake experts.

Be that as it may, the Red Cross herpetologist's advice to worried residents was to "wear knee-high boots and use a broom to sweep the creatures into a dustpan. After that, pour them into a gunny sack. Anyone who doesn't want to kill them is welcome to bring them to the Red Cross' Saowapa Institute for safekeeping."

Cobra venom is used in making antivenins. It was not reported that the Red Cross offered to send their own personnel out to collect the cobras.

Perhaps the ultimate solution to the problem will be commercially based; when news of the infestation got out, merchants began turning up to buy adult cobras caught by the villagers, paying about 300 baht each for snakes in the five-to-seven-kilogram range.



FROM THE GULF OF THAILAND

he Governor of Surat Thani Province, Vichit Vijaisarn, has reacted angrily to questions from the media about the state of Samui's flood-scarred roads and the fact that few repairs or improvements are in progress.

Widespread flooding in November caused serious damage to the island's main thoroughfares, and months later this still leads to traffic chaos.

To further add to the problem, since the New Year the island's main ring road has flooded again on several occasions in various locations, even after relatively light showers.

TRANSFER

In response to questions regarding the budget promised for much-needed repairs, the Governor chose to criticize both the Samui Municipality and the island's Highway Department for their lack of response to the situation.

Later, unconfirmed reports suggested that Gov Vichit even went so far as to transfer one of the senior officials responsible for road maintenance.

An emergency meeting was scheduled for February 24, with representatives from all the island's main public departments requested to attend.

Meanwhile, Gov Vichit instructed Buramee Patanasiri, the head of the construction and maintenance section of the Highway Department on Koh Samui to prepare a budget and action plan before the meeting.

"I would need a budget of around 1 billion baht to fully deal with the damage to Samui's roads," K. Buramee told local

media. "Unfortunately, as we have said before, this kind of funding can only come directly from the provincial governor."

Improving the quality of the roads is now one of the biggest issues facing the island, and will require cooperation between a number of public departments as well as assistance from the driving public.

However, the Governor's reaction was seen by certain locals as an attempt to divert attention from his own lack of response to the island's growing transport woes.

Police force to expand: Following the appointment of three senior officers on Koh Samui earlier this year, the police force now

plans to expand and improve its services by increasing the number of officers on the island and installing electronic equipment and new facilities, including a new police station.

The island's recently-appointed Chief Superintendent, Pol Col. Chakkrit Srisuwan recently announced the location of a new 100-million-baht police station,

which will be funded through the Municipality Office and built directly behind the island's main tourist strip in Chaweng.

Officers will be drafted in from other parts of the country to man the new station, including a second Chief Superintendent, and construction is expected to start within the next month.

In addition to these new facilities, the Samui Police Department also has been granted a budget of around 6 million baht to install CCTV cameras in seventeen locations around the island to facilitate more efficient crime prevention and detection.

The new Chief will also spend around 800,000 baht fitting special electronic checkpoints in 160 different places on Samui. Officers, using swipe cards, will document their presence at each of these checkpoints.

The new equipment is expected to be in place by the end of March 2006.

Fake passports and stolen checks: A man who tried to cash traveler's checks with a fake passport may lead the Samui police to a larger crime ring.

Filipino Alexander Soriano Rodriguez, 32, was apprehended when the teller at a branch of the Bank of Ayudhya in Chaweng noticed he was having difficulty signing his name in Japanese.

The teller called the police, who arrested the man and later discovered he was in possession of two Japanese passports with his photo inside. Rodriguez claimed to have bought them in Japan.

It later transpired that he had also bought US\$1,000 (39,381 baht) of American Express travelers checks for just 10,000 baht (US\$254) from a man in Soi Green Mango, in the heart of Samui's entertainment zone.


Police are continuing the investigation and will try to establish the source of the traveler's checks.

DVD crackdown: On February 17 a police team comprising officers from the Koh Samui Police Department, the Tourist Police and officers from Bangkok, arrested a man for smuggling and selling illegal DVDs on Koh Samui.

A police informer notified officers that Saesan Somsuk, 24, was selling copied DVDs of current movies from a side road off the main tourist strip in Chaweng. When they arrived at the scene, they found only a catalog of titles and a number of empty DVD sleeves.


Further investigation revealed that the man was renting a small shop nearby, and collecting the discs as customers ordered them. Inside the shop, police found more than 30,000 DVDs some 300 of which contained obscene material around 10,000 computer games and almost nearly 2,000 music CDs.

The total street value of the merchandise was estimated to be just under 1.5 million baht.

hat Iggy Pop – James Jewel Osterberg Jr to his family, the Godfather of Punk to some – is still alive is little short of a miracle.

Whether stagediving (a practice many credit him with inventing) onto broken bottles or "beating his brains with the liquor and drugs" – the lyric from *Lust for Life* is *No more beating my brains...* – he has survived. He will – good Lord willing and the creek don't rise – be 60 next year.

Virgin Records has recently released A Million in Prizes: The Anthology a two-CD, 38-track retrospective of his career from 1969, the album of the same year by The Stooges, full circle to Skull Ring from 2003, which saw Herr Pop recording again with The Stooges, with the almost-famous Mike Watt taking the late Dave Alexander's place on bass.

Watt, who founded indiepunk bands The Minutemen and fIREHOSE, and features the Red Hot Chili Peppers as just one band among many who cite him as an influence, recorded *The Angel's Gate* as a tribute to Alexander.

Iggy's influence is legendary: The Ramones, The Damned, The Sex Pistols, Ian Curtis, Plastic Bertrand, REM, Henry Rollins, Rage Against The Machine, Guns N' Roses, Nirvana, Green Day (also to be found on *Skull Ring*) and current darlings, The White Stripes, have all taken cues from him. Actually, I was joking about Plastic Bertrand.

The album also, naturally enough, features nine tracks from Iggy's two "Berlin" albums, *The Idiot* and *Lust For Life*, which also provides the compilation's title. More on those albums later.

The raucous opener 1969 gives way to No Fun with John Cale – then recently ex-of The Velvet Underground producing and playing viola on a track lauded as being one of the protopunk songs.

Blistering Fender riffs and manic vocals on *I Got A Right*,

IGGY BIGGIE: a retrospective

Gimme Some Skin, I'm Sick Of You and Raw Power from the critically acclaimed but commercially unsuccessful album of the same name are perhaps for diehard fans only. The latter tracks do, however, mark the beginning of the fruitful collaboration between Iggy and David Bowie.


Skipping a few tracks and years takes the listener to perhaps the golden years of Iggy's career, and the albums *The Idiot* and *Lust For Life*. Bowie produced and co-wrote both of these albums – they were released in 1977 – some five years after producing Lou Reed's seminal *Transformer*. Again, that Bowie collaboration marked what many see as Reed's most proficient release, and the period of Bowie's greatest creativity.

The years 1976-1978 saw Iggy trying to control his multitudinous drug habits. His attempts didn't succeed, and he booked himself into a psychiatric hospital, where Bowie was reportedly one of his few visitors.

Bowie went beyond this, however, and invited Iggy along on the his *Station to Station* tour, giving Iggy his first exposure to large audiences.

The two then relocated to Berlin, ostensibly to wean themselves off drugs, but ended up writing and producing Iggy's *The Idiot* and *Lust For Life*.

Songs from those albums that appear on this compilation – recorded mostly at Hansa Studios – include *China Girl, Tonight* and *Neighbourhood Threat* all



of which Bowie performed on his own albums later. The other classic songs featured are *Nightclubbing*, *Some Weird Sin*, *The Passenger* and *Lust for Life*.

The Passenger, a song widely taken to be about the quasi-nomadic existence of a ripped-to-the t*ts rock star, has almost become a parody among advertising agencies.

A quick search on www. commercialbreaksandbeats.com, which lists nigh on every UK TV advert and accompanying music, reveals that *The Passenger* was used to advertise – oh the originality of it all – cars; three differ-

ent marques in the space of six years.

That's not to denigrate it. The chiming four-chord guitar leitmotif, courtesy of Carlos Alomar and Tony Sales' ripping basslines, still excite today. To be played at maximum volume, particularly in – of course – the car.

If *The Passenger* excites, then *Lust for Life* shocks. Hunt Sales' (Tony's brother; the two worked some years later on Bowie's Tin Machine project) drumming opens the song like a vein, trashing and crashing the senses.

Again, this track has been used in many TV ads, everything from "branding" – God help us – *The Sunday People* to promoting the lowly Ford Fiesta.

Imagine the scene: a group of coked-up sniffling advertising types telling *The People* and Ford that a song with the lines:

"Here comes Johnny Yen again/With the liquor and drugs/And a flesh machine/

"He's gonna do another strip tease..."

and

"I'm worth a million in prizes/With my torture film/Drive a G.T.O./Wear a uniform/All on government loan..."

will help to sell their respective products. The G.T.O., by the way, was produced by Pontiac...

Lust for Life was used famously as the theme song to the 1996 film Trainspotting, which led to Iggy being "discovered" by a new generation. It also led him to appear on the final edition of the UK's Channel 4 show The White Room wearing naught but a pair of see-through PVC jeans.

Broadcast live, Iggy's er, ... excitement on the raised stage was clear for all to see, except when he appeared to be getting up close and personal to a woman in the audience whose head was level with his crotch – and for some time.

The 90s found Iggy embarking on a sideline film career that began almost by accident in the 80s with minor roles in *Sid And Nancy* and the Scorcese-Newman-Cruise film *The Color Of Money*.

Iggy could be seen in the post-apocalyptic *Hardware*, John Waters' *Cry-Baby* with Johnny Depp, *Tank Girl*, Jim Jarmusch's surrealistic cowboy, *Dead Man* (again with Depp), the Spanish sci-fi spaghetti western *Atolladero*, *The Crow: City Of Angels*, Depp's American Indian thriller *The Brave* (with Marlon Brando), the Chris Elliott comedy *Snow Day* and opposite Tom Waits in Jarmusch's all-star collection of vignettes *Coffee & Cigarettes*.

In their short, Somewhere in California, Iggy and Waits pretend to play themselves, smoke cigarettes to celebrate that they quit smoking, drink some coffee and have an awkward conversation. Lunatic brilliance from the auteur Jarmusch (a founding member of the secret society The Sons of Lee Marvin, to which Iggy, Nick Cave, Neil Young and Waits also belong, allegedly).

Iggy's musical career during this period consisted more of misses than hits, although his cover of *Real Wild Child* from 1986's *Blah Blah Blah*, produced again by Bowie and with ex-Pistols' guitarist Steve Jones playing lead, charted globally.

For many, the years after this are Iggy's lean years, until *Skull Ring* with The Stooges came along. The title track, which is on this compilation, boasts The Stooges' trademark loud and proud sound, with the chorus,

"Skull rings/Fast cars/Hot chicks/Money/Skull rings/Fast cars/Hot chicks/Fancy things,"

It sounds as if they have never been away.





HOME ON THE RANGER

little more than 10 years ago, Ford Thailand called a news conference at a hotel in Bangkok to announce its ambitious plans for the Thai market. Although Japanese pickup makers dominate the market, with Isuzu and Toyota accounting for more than 70% with their com-

disgraced itself in the past decade.

Ford set up a new plant at Rayong and initially produced around 135,000 pickups a year, exporting more than half of these. The firm also set up an impressive research and development center in Thailand, and has plans to introduce more new models.

Ford's Ranger has by no means

The 2006 Ford Ranger, while visually little changed from the previous model, has a whole host of improvements. Some of the features mentioned below may not yet be available on the Thai-built Rangers, but the Minnesota-produced vehicles that will kick off the line will inevitably filter down to the Kingdom.

The Ranger has been Am-



erica's best-selling compact pickup for the past 18 years, and according to Ford, it also has the highest ownership loyalty. The company says many Ranger owners simply visit their local dealer and order a new one every few years — without even checking out the opposition.

In Thailand, Ranger buyers have the choice of a four-door double-cab model or the open-cab version, which has rear-hinged back doors for ease of access and a feeling of airiness. The doors on the open-cab model are 20% thicker than on most pickups for increased protection. They open from the inside, but only after the front doors have already been opened.

Both models are equipped with a sturdy 2.5-liter turbo intercooler diesel motor, producing an impressive 277Nm of torque at the modest engine speed of just 2,000rpm. Power is inevitably a little tame at 114bhp (84kW) at 3,500rpm, but in Phuket, with its occasional steep inclines, it is the torque that counts. Ford claims the turbo engine offers the high-

est power output compared with its competitors in the same range, while at the same time offering excellent fuel economy.

The Ranger has a full safety structure that can absorb frontal impact energy in the event of a crash, protecting occupants and preventing injury.

The Thai Ranger also matches the highest safety standards applied in Europe, the US and Australia. In the double-cab model, the center B-pillar increases rigidity of the passenger compartment by as much as

Still going strong after 18 years: the Ford Ranger leads its class in the US and is making giant strides in Thailand too.

20%, and both Ranger models have side-impact beams fitted to their doors.

Dual front airbags are fitted, while the braking system – front discs, rear drums – incorporates ABS and EBD (electronic brake-force distribution) to compensate for heavy or light loads. The double-cab is also fitted with an immobilizer key.

New US-built Rangers will this year have two-tone paint jobs, something Thailand might consider. The fenders are also colormatched to the main body paint.

Ford sold 19,258 Rangers in Thailand in 2005 – 445 of them in Phuket – and it seems the Ranger will continue its sales success. The 2006 model is definitely worth a close look: it is a stylish, solid and reliable pickup.

Prices start at 400,000 baht for the standard, base "WL" model. The top-of-the-range model, the double cab 4x4 with automatic transmission, will set you back 753,000 baht.

n a variety of episodes of the Johnny Hart comic strip, BC, the main character struggles up a mountain to consult the Great Guru on a question of sublime importance — only to receive a corny send-off.

At Jay Ujjin's Ratri Jazztaurant in Kata, the results are rather more promising.

Nevertheless, there remains that mountain to be scaled.

The buzz has been on about Ratri since the middle of last year. A first-rate jazz club was under construction, those interested in such things murmured, with top talent from Bangkok on their way. We've heard similar promises before, only to be disappointed. Since Ratri opened, however, on December 29, the general impression is that the dramatic and spacious new club — which was fully 10 months in gestation — exceeds expectations.

"Jay has put Kata Beach on the map," said one devotee during a visit in January, and then enthusiastically reiterated the assertion. While some may feel Kata always had attractions enough for any "map", Ratri no doubt adds to them.

To behold it is to love it – architecture and taste are impeccable; no anachronistic kitsch, no Disney-derived wonders, obtrude on the eye. Design is Thai-Chinese throughout, yet modern too.

It is bold. The two-level cantilevered structure sits high on a hill above Kata: its steep driveway, hillside parking lot and twisting concrete stairway are ultra-intimidating. One must be wary making the approach. Proper attire is "smart casual", but with designer hiking boots.

Once at the summit, the effect is of understated and welcome luxury, along with (pant, pant) cold drinks. Downstairs is the main restaurant; up another small flight of stairs is a large loft.

There the impressive bar is

accented by blond wood flooring; broad sofas; and black lacquered tables. The electric jazz band plays on a special extension suspended above the dining room – and visible therefrom.

White dominates the color scheme; the place is well-lit. No external walls, save at the rear, support Ratri's huge concrete shell. Despite having space for several hundred persons, there are no windows. The view is dramatic, to say the least.

But much more can be said, not least about Eddie Autobahn, the guitarist, and his band. Discriminating diners might also deepen their enjoyment by contemplating the restaurant's appealing menu. Penniless hungering scribes and similar riff-raff must beware, however, of the temptation to blow all their savings in one delicious night of extravagance.

Owner Jay Ujjin, 38, a former investment banker, says he opened Ratri because he saw Phuket as "a rich man's playground with no place for the rich to play."

A passionate yachtsman, and secretary of the Ao Chalong Yacht Club, Jay retired to Phuket five years ago, leaving the cut and thrust of banking to indulge his love of yacht racing.

"I asked my girlfriend," he recalled, "what can we do to make money while still staying free enough to enjoy life?" After giving the matter some thought, he reasoned: "People with 60-million-baht vacation homes don't feel like tourists when they come

to Phuket. They feel really part of it and they need something different than the tourist scene."

Ratri, he thinks, is the answer – and crowds of guests agree.

The venue's open exterior hides a less visible concept – no more long boring waits. Dining at Ratri is civilized. One enters and ascends to the bar; has cocktails; peruses the menu, orders dinner; enjoys the frankly astonishing musical performance, then descends to one's repast when it is ready.

That, folks, is living.

The proprietor is keen on letting people know that his restaurant serves mostly "homestyle" cooking "as they eat in good Thai houses." He makes the point that most of what's palmed off on tourists as "royal Thai cuisine" is only distantly related to what aristocrats eat at home. It is the latter that Ratri aims at.

But, in fact, nothing more tempting than the Eddie Autobahn Faction, Ratri's fusion jazz band, is needed to pull one up the hill. They are, in the language of phys-

ics, the venue's "sufficient reason".

Other establishments can boast of good food or appealing décor; but only Ratri has a band such as this. All members are first-class musicians with long experience in the fusion genre, as typified by artists such as Stanley Jordan, Keith Jarrett and David Sanborn.

It is high-energy music, upbeat and danceable (unlike, say, bebop). Leader Eddie "Autobahn" Makaranond led a popular touring jazz group in Europe (named "Autobahn" – thus the name) for 15 years before returning to Thailand, where he put together his "Faction." They became one of Bangkok's premier bands, and as such attracted Jay's notice.

"I love jazz," he said, and explained that after seeing Eddie and the boys he realized they were the only band for him. "It took me two years to get this band."

They were worth the wait. Eddie is a consummate guitarist and vocalist, and his fellows are no less impressive.

Pianist Robert Paggao is simply dazzling; multi-woodwinds virtuoso Yongyuth Piusuwan is a brilliant soloist and showman; and bassist Pol Chalanon drives the band's irrepressible rhythms along with the constantly shimmering sounds of drummer Sukhum Liupichart.

Ballads occupy the dinner hour; but the band fairly erupts in fully fused panoply after 10 pm. On a recent warm night in January, they played tunes by Grover Washington Jr and Tower of Power, among others. But as Eddie himself observed, "It doesn't really matter what the song is, because we play it our way, and never play anything the same way twice."

Now that's jazz in my book. In Phuket, where the earth's surface ferments in constant change, landmarks come and go; but Ratri Jazztaurant will remain memorable for its elevated approach – both up the mountain, and as an aesthetic.



SMALL IS BEAUTIFUL

Il At Sea took to the water this month in a duo of vessels from Jeanneau, both supplied by Lee Marine.

The boats in question – the Merry Fisher 655 Marlin and the Leader 545 – may not be in the multi-million-baht category, but precisely the same attention to detail is put into their design and build as goes into Janneau's bigger boats, and they have a wealth of creature comforts crammed into them.

The undoubted value that these crafts offer makes them ideal entry-level vessels, while their size, ease of handling and agility also makes then suitable as day boats, perfect for zipping from one island to the next, or, as the name of the 655 suggests, for a day gone fishing.

The new Merry Fisher 655 Marlin (2.7 million baht) incorporates all the essentials of a boat designed specifically for fishermen. Accomplished voice of Western Australia

THE TURNING

probably the most accomplished Australian writer of his generation – two of his seven novels have been shortlisted for the Booker Prize. The Turning (Picador, Sydney, 2005, 317pp) is his third book of short stories.

Like William Faulkner's fic-

tional Yoknapatawpha County, Winton works his own literary patch: the little coastal towns of Angelus and White Point south of Perth in Western Australia, a fertile land of great scenic beauty squeezed between the Indian Ocean and the outback desert. There are miles

of deserted white sand beaches, and the young people of his tales spend much of their time fishing and surfing. They are also a lonely and tormented lot.

The Turning is not so much a collection of short stories as a severely fragmented novel. As is true of all small towns, the people

in these stories know each other and interact constantly, so you wind up with a multifaceted narrative of many perspectives – high-school students, cops, fishermen and abused wives.

At the narrative center of these 17 stories is miserable teenager Vic Lang. He has moved from "the city" (Perth) to White

Point, where his father has been posted as a police constable. In high school, he has no friends and is tormented by his love for a girl in the class ahead of him, a beauty marred by a strawberry birthmark that covers half her face.

His father is falling apart. As heroin filters into high school circles in the 1970s, he suspects a quartet of police detectives are behind it. Tormented and sleepless, he develops a drinking problem and finally deserts his family. Vic moves back to Perth with his mother, who manages to put him through law school by cleaning houses. Twenty-six years later, as his mother is dying of cancer, Vic tracks down his father in the outback.

That is one narrative trunk in this book of stories, but there are many branches that shoot from it.

There is the life-long friendship of the brilliant high school student Jackie with the town misfit, Boner McPharlin, who winds up abandoned on a beach with both legs broken - somehow involved in drugs. Vic Lang's father enters the picture here.

After his wife's suicide in Perth, another character, Peter Dyson, returns to Angelus with his six-year-old son, Ricky. He

t 46, Tim Winton is renovates his mother's abandoned house and rekindles a friendship with his old football coach and the coach's wife, only to be confronted with the return of their daughter, his high-school sweetheart and recovering heroin addict. He soon finds himself trapped in a vicious game of emotional blackmail.

> Then there is the rivalry between two brothers, Jack and Max, from their childhood to adulthood. Jack ends up becoming a Perth football star nicknamed Leaper. Max stays behind in White Point, a drunken, wife-beating fisherman. The two have a bitter reunion years

later while surfing on a deserted beach.

When it comes to describing nature and action, Tim Winton rivals Ernest Hemingway. Here he describes Jack on his surfboard as he watches Max being attacked by a shark:

"A surge of turbulence

passed between Max and him, a sudden fattening of the water that caused Leaper to blink. His brother had his back to him, was still paddling away, when a bronze flash jerked him sideways on the board and drove him high in the water, spinning him round so that Leaper saw his open mouth within the streaming

beard and the shark moiling beneath him. A second later he was all flailing arms that went under a moment until he surfaced in a pink smear.'

There are plenty of lyrical passages about the stunning natural beauty of the coast, and also great flashes of humor between the characters, but the overall mood is glum. Winton's heroes are invariably lonely and tortured souls. For a country supposedly awash in mateship and beer, they never darken the door of a pub.

In middle age, Vic follows his father into brooding introspection, hauled back into the world only by his irrepressible wife Gail. Two of the stories in *The Turn*ing are told from her comical point of view. The final story, when Vic is 46, ends on a note of hope.

"There is a wide variety of bar sports to play with any of your new found friends. Games such as bang the nail into the lump of tree stump are popular." (1)

Phuket – not to be sniffed at: "It's almost axiomatic that airline

travel promotes colds and other maladies, but we'd both managed to avoid this drawback since starting our adventure two years ago.

"However, a trip to Phuket (silent 'h'), a tropical island off the west coast of Thailand, is a long haul, even from Europe. From Istanbul, it was 3 plane segments and nearly 24 hours climaxed by 30 minutes in a slowmoving immigration line at Phu-

ket's airport and a 40 minute taxi ride to our hotel. Somewhere along the way, a bug got through my formidable defenses and symptoms began to appear. But, if you gotta have a cold, Phuket is a great spot!" (2)

More truisms, same site:

"They have huge speakers pumping out American urban black hip hop music complete with objectionable lyrics.

"As far as I am concerned this is the final nail in the Thailand coffin. I do not save my money and wait to fly half away around the world to Thailand to hear American urban hip hop black music.

"Good bye the Thai experience. It used to be that when you went into a bar in Thailand that there were about 6 signature Thai songs that told you that you were back in Thailand. Now I do not hear even that anymore. Now the music in the bars is mostly or completely American rock music.

'What happened to the bragging nationalistic jingoistic Thais so convinced that Thailand was special? More empty talk. Thailand is not special when they do not even play their own excellent pop music in the bars. Too bad." (3)

Double or quadruple standards? "A quirk of self-dignity is their possession: in Thailand a man is licensed to have one and only one female friend, in any capacity. Bargirls as acquaintances often feel humiliation and anger, and will vent it, if a man is seen as much as walking up the street with another women.

"The ownership may arise from a casual conversation on the street and the bargirl may have slept with umpteen men in that time. The hypocrisy and conviction never ceases to amaze me. Something that entirely infuriates bargirls is any kind of platonic, wholesome or intellectual relationship with somebody else.

"Lack of education means bargirls are in no position to compete, if the one thing they do offer doesn't work. Bonking somebody else is far more acceptable to a bargirl than talking about world affairs over coffee." (4)

Phuket's loss is Samui's gain:

"I have just returned from boom island. A few months ago I was bemoaning the massive development of one small tropical island.

"But now I find myself in a tenuous position because whilst all that development looked horribly overdone it now almost looks like 'not enough.' It is a very long time since I have been anywhere and only met businessmen who are happy with their lot. Koh Samui is thriving with bar, hotel and restaurant owners barely believing their luck. After so many years of no real high season, Samui's peak season is only now just beginning to turn into a high season.

"Of course most will point to the tsunami sending people from Phuket. Needless to say that has been a contributing factor, but I am told things were pretty good in the run up to Christmas and it was not just the events of December 26th that created the boom." (5)



Back to bedlam in Patong

After the *Gazette* published the online version of the story about the stinking seaweed on Patong Beach (see News, this issue), we received an email from a Scandinavian engineer specializing in water and wastewater technology.

"The problem is directly linked to excessive nutrients being discharged into the bay because of faulty or non-existent wastewater treatment," he wrote.

In May 2004, there was a similar incident with green seaweed suddenly appearing. On that occasion, the experts declared the seaweed harmless. Indeed, one could even suggested a seaweed eating festival.

The most recent seaweed incident is rather less pleasant than the last one. The reek from the rotting seaweed is unlikely to compel anyone that they should scoop it up and serve it in restaurants.

What a sad indictment this is of the authorities in Patong. The town has a long history of greed distorting decision making. Not so long ago, a mayor was fired by the then-Interior Minister after trying to extort 2 million baht from a contractor building the town's wastewater system.

The ex-mayor is still serving a five-year exile from politics for "conduct likely to bring the Patong Municipality into disrepute".

When the tsunami arrived, it apparently scoured the bay; many people said afterwards that they had not seen the water so clear for a long time. On the reverse side of the coin, the tsunami also did serious damage to the town's infrastructure, including the wastewater treatment system.

Any delight over the clear water was short-lived. Now Patong is back where is was two years ago, with untreated sewage contaminating the bay, as evidenced by the invasion of stinking seaweed.

The wastewater system took years and years to install – far longer than it should have – and at least some of the blame lies with those who put private gain ahead of the public good; those who take the view that contractors who pay the most under the table should get the contracts, regardless of whether they have sufficient experience, know-how and funding to complete the job without running out of money.

Surely it is time for a more farsighted view, one that sees the bigger picture: if Patong is clean and pleasant, then the tourists will come. If it is not – as a result of people trying to pocket 2 million baht in bribes – then the tourists will go elsewhere.

Everyone will lose, including those who think they can make a quick baht or two.

Grilled guides

I would have expected Panomphol Thummachartniyom, the president of the Phuket Professional Guide Association, to have been vehemently against allowing just anyone to be a guide [Gazette February 25]. In the following I will refer only to nature guides.

Even the best Thai nature guides do not match global standards. This situation is not merely a product of the Thai educational system nor the culture of this great land; It goes much deeper.

There is more to being a topnotch guide than simply regurgitating learned names. A true highquality guide knows about the interrelationship of all living beings and can relate the facts to tourists. Furthermore, a guide should be knowledgeable about the global struggle to gain protection of fragile ecosystems, as well as the environmental politics involved in the conflict.

In the more than 13 years that I have lived in southern Thailand, I have yet to find a Thai guide who could debate environmental politics, describe relationships between different environmental systems, or chat about some of the champions of the fight to preserve nature, both in Thailand and abroad.

The reality of the situation is that there is a need for foreign guides in certain branches of tourism. Truly great nature guides are rare, even in the West. Having the hurdle of a complicated language like English is more than most Thais will be able to clear, but – even if the language barrier is defeated – there are cultural traits and behaviors in the West that are foreign to native Thais.

To say across the board that foreigners should not be allowed to be guides is racist and, more importantly, the highest end of the tourism industry simply cannot proceed without foreign guides.

I bet if K. Panomphol went on vacation to the US, he'd search out a Thai guide to tell him all about it.

The harms race

In supporting the province's decision to host the Asian Jet-Ski Championships here, the editorial of the *Gazette* of February 25 argues that this event will

somehow have no connection to the dire situation along Phuket beaches, where hardly a week passes without a jet-ski accident – the latest death from which reportedly came at the end of January.

The *Gazette* should take a close look at the sponsors of this event to see if they are not the jet-ski manufacturers themselves, who have every interest in promoting their products on Phuket – an island that claims to be trying to phase out jet-skis.

The primary target of jet-ski manufacturers remains the more attention-seeking individuals among the idle rich, but in a place like Phuket, where influential figures enjoy the upper hand, they also enjoy an important secondary market: the "jet-ski rental" industry

Jet-ski manufacturers and this rental industry will both no doubt see the provincial go-ahead for this event as good news. I wonder how the family and friends of jet-ski victims will feel about it.

As for how far this event will go to promote tourism, don't expect much. Jet-ski racing is the very epitome of a "trash sport", created by the manufacturers and cable television broadcasters to fill late-night air time on secondary sports networks like ESPN2. To the extent that this event exposes Phuket to a foreign viewing audience, which won't be much, expect it to turn off more potential tourists than it attracts.

When will our government realize that the key to a sustainable tourism industry lies in environmental protection and not shameless spectacle?

Not driving recklessly

ach case must be examined individually, and people should realize that our drivers don't want an accident to happen as it costs [the drivers] money. It means a loss of income if the car needs repairing and sometimes it takes up to a month to fix a car if a lot of repairs are required.

Crashes are an occupational hazard because we use the roads frequently. The roads in Phuket are not good and there is much too much construction going on, as well as too much other traffic. The roads are also too narrow and this creates traffic jams, which waste a lot of time.


So when our drivers are not hindered by these factors, they drive faster; This does not mean that they are negligent, but sometimes accidents will happen.


Our drivers are always careful and especially so after picking passengers up. [Accidents] are not always our fault sometimes other drivers pull out without even looking.

I have noticed that the behavior of drivers in Phuket is not so good. Some people insist on driving slowly in the outside lane when they should be keeping to the left lane.

However, I accept that some of our drivers do go faster than 90kmh [the supposed national speed limit] but only when the road is empty and conditions are safe. But we cannot really be accused of going too fast because there are so many traffic had green [taxi] license plates.

ver the past six weeks alone, three people have been killed in three separate crashes involving limousine drivers on Sathienthapanakij Rd (also known as the airport road). On January 22, an airport limousine driver died in a high-speed smash on the outskirts of Phuket City. On January 26, a pedestrian was struck and killed by a limousine on the airport road, and on February 2 a limousine smashed at high speed into the rear





jams here, which do slow us

Let me explain the three accidents that happened recently: As regards the first case on January 22, in which the driver was killed because he was driving too fast, well, he was not even a member of our cooperative, yet people automatically assumed he was when they saw that his car

The second death, on January 26, was because the person was drunk and jaywalking. What can we do about people like that?

The accident with the water truck happened because the truck was in the right-hand lane watering the grass in the median strip and did not have properly functioning rear lights. Our driver could not tell if it was moving or not (K. Niphon did not explain how he learned this, bearing in mind that the driver died. -Ed,).

We always remind our members – verbally and in writing – to be careful while driving, to respect traffic laws and to keep to the speed limits. If we get complaints from tourists about certain drivers going too fast, then we ask [the tourists] to tell us more. We then issue a warning letter and the worst punishment we mete out is a three- to- five-day ban from driving for the company. Realistically speaking we cannot be stricter than this because even one day off work means a lot of income lost.

Today, we have 135 members and most of them own their own car. On an average day they will make six- to- seven round trips to the airport. A one-way trip from Patong usually takes about an hour; a trip from the Tesco-Lotus superstore about 30 min-

We always tell our passengers to fasten their safety belts and each car has first-class insurance, but I must repeat that we do not wish for any accident to happen, either for us or for our

If passengers are not happy with the driver then they are free to contact our office. Conversely, passengers sometimes specifically ask for a driver to go faster than normal as they may be late for a plane or an appointment. In this case, what can we do?

At the moment we're looking into installing a Global Positioning System receiver in each of our cars to find out exactly where they are and how fast they are traveling. In addition, we plan to introduce "better driving courses" so that our employees will appreciate their work more. We made merit at the beginning of this year to make sure that this, the Chinese Year of the Dog, will be a good one.

There are no special procedures for pregnant women. Your sister can follow the normal entry procedure. Students from India can ask for a "Non-immigration ED visa" at the Thai Embassy in India.

Please be aware that airlines will not allow women who are more than seven months pregnant to fly.

Incidentally, babies born to foreign parents in Thailand do not get Thai nationality. The birth should be registered at the appropriate embassy of the parents' nationality.

This policy will stay, and tourists who want to join a tour boat must board at Chalong Pier or Rassada Pier.

In the past few decades, there has been an increase in the numbers of people admitting to being procrastinators. A study in the US showed that in 1978. it was 15%. The figure rose to 60% in 2002. Of course, this also raises the question of whether we're becoming more honest, or simply

The earliest reference to procrastination I've managed to find was by a

Greek poet in 800BC, who said, "A man who puts off work is always at hands-grip with ruin".

The Hindus went further and in 500BC described the most evil kind of person, those they called Taamasika agents, "undisciplined, vulgar, stubborn, wicked, malicious, lazy, depressed, and procrastinating". Taamasika were denied rebirth and sent to hell, which must have had a long waiting line because of all the procrasti-

"To procrastinate" basically means putting off work that you could be doing now. This actually means that everyone is procrastinating all the time, because there

be doing now, but you have to prioritize and choose only one or two things to do.

Instead of writing this article, for example, I could be learning how to belly dance, write a best-selling novel, or run off to the big city to find myself a sugar daddy.

If psychologists have the time to study the phenomenon of why songs get stuck in your head, then they certainly have the time to study procrastination, and, more importantly, how to cure someone of it. All of them would more or less

agree on 10 basic tips, which include thinking positively, being organized, and starting with the easiest task.

All of this may be very nice in theory, but it rarely works in practise. Teenagers who have turned procrastination into an art are motivated by something completely different – the threat of consequences.

If there is no danger to life or limb, a job is put off indefinitely. Also, many tasks, if postponed for long enough, will take care of themselves, which means that you don't really have to write that letter to your great uncle because he'll die soon enough any-

Being in my final year of high school, are always hundreds of things you could I am a keen practitioner and observer of

procrastination. The air around me is heavy and stifling with it. Caffeine is the ambrosia of today's teenagers, and I've known one or two who would even eat dry instant coffee to get them through the allnighters. If we weren't so lazy, we would probably organize an award for the greatest procrastinator.

There is another solution to the problem of procrastination – find a scapegoat. We are simply weak-willed primates held in thrall by the real culprit: the computer and its minions Minesweeper, Pacman and Tetris. Then came the Internet, bringing with it MSN Messenger, and online games in which you can beat up penguins. I'm late? It's all the computer's fault.

One benefit of procrastination is that it has spurred companies into exploiting huge market opportunities – after all, everyone procrastinates.

A vicious cycle is created: the more products there are available for procrastination, the more procrastination occurs, which makes the market larger, creating demand for new products.

One product still missing is an unmessy way of injecting caffeine straight into the vein to keep you running during all-nighters. And much evil has also been born from this vicious cycle – sitcoms and Tamagochis being prime examples.

For the absolutely desperate procrastinator, there is another way of stopping time. As Einstein's Theory of Relativity explains, because of the dilation of time, it is theoretically possibly to slow time almost to a stop if you travel quickly enough. Even if you zipped along at 7.7 kilometers a second, however, you'd still slow down time by only three nanoseconds.

Payback time for a 'friend'

he following is an example of what can happen when financial help is rewarded with absolutely nothing by way of appreciation, despite there being an agreement between the parties.

Mr R, a long-time resident of Phuket, aided a "friend" – not for the first time – by setting him up in business and drawing up a proper business plan for him. He

also loaned him seed money to get the business going.

From having nothing at all, the recipient soon found himself with four different successful businesses – and as many private cars. But he neglected to show his appreciation; he failed to pay back the initial loan he had received to kickstart these successful ventures.

The "friend" made Mr R many promises, all the while complaining about how bad business was, and about how much pressure was on him to make other payments he owed.

Mr R was, therefore, forced into finding another way of communicating with him, and decided to appoint a law firm to demand payment officially. This went unanswered, so he filed a case through the courts in an effort to retrieve his money.

This move appeared to work. After being contacted through the court, the "friend" finally telephoned Mr R to talk about repayment.

Subsequently, however, he unwilling or unable to honor the final payment schedule he had himself drawn up.

\A Court Arbitrator was then appointed to negotiate a repayment schedule for the loan – plus accrued interest.

A totally different attitude emerged during arbitration, with the "friend" demonstrating that he was willing to make payments, but



saying that the prevailing business climate did not permit him to make a one-off settlement of the total amount. He was willing to pay installments over a period of two years instead.


Both parties, therefore, were able to reach agreement using court arbitration, and the case was closed.

The advantage Mr R gained by using arbitration was that he saved himself having to go through a full court procedure potentially lasting one or two years – or even longer if the "friend" decided to contest a decision against him through the appeals system.

Arbitration also meant that, if the debt remained unpaid, the court ruling could be used for immediate enforcement; as long as the "friend" had enough assets, Mr R could get his money back.

In Mr R's case the court even ordered that he receive a refund of a large proportion of the legal fees he had paid, as the case was settled before any witnesses had to be heard.

This case shows that court arbitration can lead the parties in a dispute to talk to each other and to reach a settlement, without either too much time or money being wasted.



Do non-Buddhists have to convert on marriage?

Dear Momma Duck,

What is the procedure in Thailand for a foreigner marrying a Thai girl? Does the ceremony have to be held at a Buddhist temple? What happens if the man is of a different religion? Is he expected to convert?

Dear Akgun,

The legal procedure for a foreigner who wishes to marry a Thai is as follows:

- You will need a certificate of "non-impediment" issued by your home country's embassy in Bangkok (this means that as far as the embassy is aware, you are not already married).
- You will also need your passport, and your fiancée will need her national ID card and house registration document (tabien baan).
- With this paperwork and on paying a small fee, a marriage may be registered at the District

It is probably wise to bring along a friend to the wedding who is able translate from Thai to English and vice versa, as well as to be there as an official witness.

Now we can turn to the interesting and complex cultural aspects of such a marriage.

Traditionally, it is normal for the man to give a dowry to the bride's family, which can be anything from US\$50 to US\$2,000. However, this practice, although still common in rural areas and with girls whose families have strong rural roots, is dying out among the more educated urban middle and upper classes.

dren in tow may be considered outside traditional dowry requirements, especially if the groom

agrees to take responsibility for the children, although each case is subject to negotiation.

Legally, wedding ceremony is not a requirement, but culturally, it is nearly always considered necessary. Normally, the ceremony is held either at the bride's home or at a public facility such as a hotel, communal hall or restaurant. The location is up to the families of the bride and groom.

In rural areas, most weddings are held at the home of the bride, and may take some days to prepare. Thais who live in cities usually prefer to have wedding ceremonies at hotels.

A full ceremony in an urban area often consists of two parts. First, there is a morning ceremony at the bride's house during which alms are given to monks. This is essentially to bring luck and an auspicious start to the union, but there is no Buddhist ceremony directly related to the act of marriage. This ceremony is usually restricted to the couple's relatives.

In the late afternoon or evening is the traditional "marriage" reception for everyone. This usually starts with a waterpouring - or a bai-si or stringtying – ceremony when people older than the couple give their


This is usually followed by a sit-down dinner, with hundreds of guests, complete with master of ceremonies and

speeches.

Nowadays, gifts are usually in the form of cash inserted in the envelope the original wedding invitation came in. With hundreds of guests attending, this may seem like a lot of money for the couple, but the reception dinner is a major expense that may "eat up" most of the cash gifts.

Finally, Buddhists do not "con-

vert" others to their beliefs, and, therefore, do not expect non-Buddhists to change their religion upon marriage. Buddhism recognizes all other faiths, so do not worry about your own religion if you want to marry a Thai.

"The extra resources and the streamlining of procedures direct to the Governor's Office [as opposed to going through Kathu District Office] will facilitate foreign investment in Patong," he added.

Apart from being able to present projects direct to the

> Governor's Office, Patong Municipality would also get an extra municipal councilor and expanded powers for administering the town.


Patong Municipality has already submitted its request to the Governor of Phuket. If approved, the request will be passed to the Ministry of Interior for consideration by the Cabinet. The process is expected to take a year.

A door-to-door survey conducted at the end of January found that Patong has 12,701 Thai residents, 8,110 houses and 2,149 families. The population density is 775 people per square kilome-

"The duo were signed to A&M Records and charted with three successive singles in the Top-10 including Que Sera Sera and 1979's A Little Lovin' (Keeps The Doctor Away). The latter song narrowly missed hit status in the US after a typographical error in Billboard

magazine showed the record sliding down the charts after a promising start and A&M US pulled all promotion on the record.

"In the 1970s The Raes were nominated for two Juno Awards and became hosts of CTV's popular Circus show and were offered a chance at a firm five-year TV contract of their own – which they turned down because the record company felt it would effect sales.

'Cherrill and Robbie divorced in the early 1980s. Following the demise of the disco act, Robbie tried to make a go of it on Quality Records in 1983 with a song Finger On It, which the label hailed as a new direction for him – the B-side, *Rachel*, was written by future Refugee exponent Myles Hunter.

However, the following year he found himself on Mel Shaw's Music World Creation touting another Hunter tune, *Hold* On To The Night, also to no effect.

"In 1989 he teamed up with Saga members Jim Gilmour and Steve Negus in GNP, under the pseudonym Robert Bevan. They released one album for Virgin Records. In October 1999, Rae moved to Thailand (Kamala Beach - Phuket) and invested in his own outdoor bar as well as singing at Tai Pan with his band. The bar itself was destroyed and Robbie Rae's whereabouts were briefly a mystery following the devastation of the tsunami on December 26, 2004, but he turned up safe and sound.

"He began to have some serious problems with drinking a few years back and everyone rallied to try to get him off this path of self-destruction. To their credit, his employers at Tai Pan, Bob and Darren, and Tai Pan's other singer, Harry K, went the distance with him and never gave up. They checked him into several detox clinics at their expense but in the end his de-

mon got the better of him.

"In rock 'n' roll there is saying, 'Live fast, die young and leave a beautiful corpse,' and this is reflection of the inherent hedonism in the industry. Robbie was a true rock 'n' roll guy who lived life to the full, was always the center of any crowd, was quick to smile and even quicker to make you smile. And I never spent a bad minute in his company.'

As a tribute to Robbie and to support his family during this difficult time – he was the sole breadwinner – a fund-raising night featuring many of the island's top musicians, along with Harry K, and Johnnie and Steve from the UK performing sax and percussion, will be staged at Tai Pan on March 4.

I sincerely hope that we, as a community, get behind this event to show our support and to remember a man who has become part of the history, if not of the island, then at least of Patong.



How do I see Clipboard in XP?

Is the Clipboard Viewer still available in Windows XP? I can't find any reference to it in your Windows XP All-in-One Desk Reference for Dummies.

If it is, how can I access it, please?

Microsoft screwed up the old Clipboard Viewer, and now, for instance, you can't "stockpile" multiple clips or swap clips with networked computers. Oddly enough, though, the Help menu still says you can do these things...

That said, if you just want to see what's on your Clipboard, the new, stripped-down Clipbook Viewer works fine.

Windows XP's Clipboard Viewer is called the "ClipBook Viewer" and although it's flawed, it lets you see what's on your Clipboard. Here's how to put Windows XP's Clipbook Viewer onto your Start menu.

KHUN WOODY'S COMPUTER

- 1. Click the Start menu button and open My Computer.
- 2. Open your "C:" drive listed in the Hard Disk Drives section
- 3. Double-click on the Windows folder. You might have to tell it to let you see what's inside.
- 4. Double-click on the System32 folder. Again, you might have to tell it to let you see what's inside
- 5. Scroll down the page until you locate a file named Clipbrd (Clipbrd.exe in full).
- 6. Drag and drop the Clipbrd file onto your Start button.

Just let go of your mouse button when it's pointing at the Start button; that drops a shortcut to the Clipbook Viewer onto your Start menu. When you next open your Start menu, the Clipbrd program's icon will appear near the top.

Whenever you want to see exactly what's being stored on your Clipboard, click Start | Clipbrd. The ClipBook Viewer will appear, allowing you to see its contents.

The new Office Clipboard Viewer, in the latest version of Office XP, works much better.

For a non-Microsoft solution, Karen's Clipboard Viewer works well.

I just bought a Dell E310 with Windows XP Home Media Center pre-installed. It also has Word Perfect 12 pre-installed.

When using Outlook Express I cannot activate the spell-check – it is grayed out. What can I do that won't cost me a fortune (like buying Microsoft Word for US\$219)?

I hope you can answer this for me as it seems that Dell has changed its policy.

I paid for a four-year home warranty, but Dell now tells me that the warranty covers only hardware. If I want to get their software support, it will cost on a call fee basis.

I called Microsoft and they wouldn't help me either. They said that Dell probably tweaks MS software and only Dell can answer my question – of course, for the required fee.

It makes me wish I never got into computers. And this is my third Dell PC...

You are not going to like the answer. The spell checker in Outlook Express uses the dictionary installed with Microsoft Office.

You can install almost any version of Office – Office 97, 2000, XP or 2003 – or any of the Office applications – Word, Excel or PowerPoint – and you'll get the dictionary. But you have to buy it and install it.

Microsoft should have made this plain, up front.

I recently lost my Mozilla Firefox Bookmarks using a clean-up utility. I have found the old ones by using Windows Search, but now my dilemma is how to get Firefox to recognize

I have checked Mozilla-Zine's Lost Bookmarks webpage for directions on how to do this, but I am finding the actual practical procedure somewhat confusing, to say the least.

Also, how do I back up my Bookmarks in Firefox to safeguard against losing them again?

On a different note, how do I do run Scan Disk in Windows XP Pro?

It's easier than it looks. Firefox bookmarks are saved in an HTML file. To import bookmarks from a file, here's how:

Start Firefox. Click Bookmarks | Manage Bookmarks. Click File | Import... Click the button marked "From File", then click "Next". Choose the file, click Open. When Firefox is done, click OK.

To create a backup of your Bookmarks in Fire fox:

Start Firefox. Click Bookmarks | Manage Bookmarks. Click File | Export... Select where you want the backup file saved, enter the name you want to call your backup file, and click Save.

You can still run Scan Disk in Windows XP Pro. Click Start | My Computer, right-click on the drive you want to check, and choose Properties. Click the Tools tab, then under Error-Checking, click Check Now.

You will probably need to re-start your computer, but when you do, Windows will run a full Check Disk.

ne of the greatest risks to continuing global economic expansion is the supply of oil. Western industry analysts estimate that around 42% of total oil production is in countries that are considered either politically hostile or unstable.

The reason alternatives have not been developed is quite simple – until recently the price of oil was low, and therefore the economic incentive to diversify was absent. The situation has obviously changed now, and it is reassuring to note that not everybody has simply been relying on traditional sources.

There are two interesting examples of solving the supply problem that are already operating and that, when compared with current oil prices, offer cheaper alternatives.

The first, which has been in commercial use for around 35 years, is of South African origin and is managed by a company

called Sasol. This was a South African government initiative in the late 1960s. At that time, from a South African perspective, the world was a hostile environment with an everincreasing tendency to levy economic sanctions.

Pretoria was concerned that the United Nations would pass resolu-

tions restricting the flow of oil to South Africa, in an effort to inflict economic paralysis and thereby force political change. It therefore became an imperative to pre-empt such a situation by developing a cost-effective alter-

South Africa is extremely rich in a vast array of mineral resources, but in the 1960s it was totally dependent on imports for oil.

The country developed, through Sasol, a method of extracting oil from coal, and found that it was comparatively simple and cheap to produce. And coal is a mineral that South Africa has in abundance.

To distribute Sasol output was also simple; the government made it a legal requirement that every gas station in South Africa, regardless of which oil company

had its stamp on the business, also had to include one Sasol pump on its forecourt. And this was not some low-grade product; the octane figure for Sasol is given as

South Africa is now accepted as being a "politically correct" country, but Sasol still exits. It is a publicly quoted company on the Johannesburg Stock Exchange, and – helped by rising

> oil prices globally its profit jumped 80% in 2005. There is even a small city called Sasolburg about 60 kilometers south of Johannesburg.

One of the guest speakers at the recent World Economic Forum, at Davos in Switzerland, was the CEO of Sasol, Pat Davies. He gave a very revealing in-

terview to the media.

Today, Sasol sources its gasoline from different resources - coal and natural gas. The company is not just looking at South Africa, its traditional market, but is also in advanced negotiations with Nigeria – as that country's Foreign Minister, Oluyemi Adeniji, readily admitted.

However, it is in Qatar that Sasol is making its first global production shift. Later this year the Gulf state will start production in a joint venture with Sasol, at a facility that will immediately begin producing 250,000 barrels of oil a day (bpd).

Two further Qatari plants, in a joint venture with Sasol and China, will each start producing 80,000 bpd from 2009.

When one considers the high amount of coal and natural gas reserves in the world, the

sugar cane. This can be refined to produce ethanol, and has become extremely popular. Almost every gas station in Brazil now offers two choices to its customers: gasoline or ethanol.

Car manufacturers have long been aware of the situation, and now incorporate dual technologies in many of their vehicles. Ford in Brazil, for example, makes more than 80% of its cars with dual technology, while Volkswagen's production is even higher, at 95%.

Every time the world oil price exceeds US\$38 a barrel, Brazilians simply switch to ethanol, since it is at this point that ethanol becomes cheaper.

The US Dollar hangs on: Anyone who pays attention to the fi-

nancial media can hardly have failed to notice recent predictions that the US dollar will collapse in value against other currencies.

The reasons cited for this include the large US current account deficit, budget deficit, consumer indebtedness and a fall in the domestic housing market.

There are two major reasons why the US dollar maintains its poise, however.

First, economic growth in the US is robust and interest rates continue to rise, so the rewards of holding US dollars remain at-

Second, as Stephen Jen, head of foreign currency research at Morgan Stanley, states, many countries, mostly Asian, are excellent at producing manufactured goods, but their financial institutions and markets are much less well developed and are unable to absorb the enormous cash surplus.

Faced with vast amounts of cash to invest, they are naturally attracted to the largest and most liquid of all financial markets – the US.

KARON: The Rainbow Warriors and two multinational sides, the from South Africa have confirmed they will be back to defend their title as reigning champions in the 8th Phuket International Rugby 10s, to be played at Karon Stadium on May 27 and 28.

The Warriors are one of the 20 teams from at least nine countries that have confirmed they will take part in this year's Rugby

In addition to the home side, the Phuket Vagabonds, former champs the Moorabbin Rams (formerly the Melbourne Cruiser Rams), and the 2003 champions, British Club Bangkok (which this year will field two squads), will be competing for glory.

Other teams also confirmed are, from Thailand, Bangkok Japanese, Southerners Bangkok and Thai Babarians; Selangor Dog and Penang All Blues from Malaysia; Asian French Baba's from Vietnam; Bucks RFC, Wanderers RFC and Bedock Kings from Singapore; Pot Bellied Pigs from Hong Kong; Flying Kukris from Brunei; Al Ain Amblers RFU from the UAE; Tulsa USA,

Flying Elvises and Magnum RFC.

Key organizer Patrick Cotter explained to the Gazette that the tournament will go ahead without a major sponsor. "Air-Asia, due to budget constraints, were not in a position to sponsor this year's event," he said.

"It will have no effect on the competition, but if sponsors want to step forward they will benefit from the tournament being shown around the world on ESPN Star Sports, which covered the event last year. It was on the Rugby Show, Sports Center and even on CNN Sports," he added.

He said that he expected a high level of rugby to be on show as reigning champions Rainbow Warriors are expected to return with former Springbok players in their team. In addition, the Thai Babarians team is fielding mostly Thai national squad members.

However, Mr Cotter said that the program still has room for four more teams, though he urged teams thinking about joining to get

a move on. "There are a couple of teams that are interested but have yet to confirm," he said.

Entry fee is US\$400 per team, and teams must register by April 30. "Don't forget we need a team pic and team 'bio' for the program," Mr Cotter added

Money raised at the Phuket Rugby 10s will be donated to the Ronda Butler Memorial Fund to support continuing education for children orphaned by the tsunami in Phuket and Khao Lak.

Four teams have signed up for the "Blooming Old Codgers Comp", for players over 40 years old: Phuket's own Viagrabonds, HKFC (Hong Kong Football Club), Bangkok Bangers and The Old Bill from Hong Kong.

They will compete for the inaugural Weasel Trophy, in honor of long-time Phuket resident Peter Froadsham, from Canada also known by his Phuket Hash House Harriers moniker "Lord Weasel Tits" - who died last year.

Maybe, he said, his opponent in the final, Chaipong Laem-khaothong, had played too much


the previous day and, as a result, was tired.

Construction started in April last year and all units should be complete by June next year. She said that the show house is now ready to be viewed and that three villas are already under construction. Prices start at 19 million baht.


After the success of Baan Thai Surin Hill, the company wished to develop another similar project in simple, white, black and brown tones to complement all styles of furnishings, she said.

sunken bathtub, and all bathrooms will have garden views while sliding doors on two sides will open from the bathroom to the bedroom to, as K. Wanwipa commented, "... heighten the sense of spaciousness."

American Standard sanitaryware will be used for bathroom fittings.

The kitchen will sport black granite countertops, imported Teka brand appliances, such as refrigerator and oven, and a double sink.

All internal floors will be laid with premium-grade tiles, and the built-in cupboards are to be constructed of solid wood and plywood with teak veneer.

Sliding doors and windows will be made from black aluminum with tinted glass, and come with sliding insect screens.

The project will have its own underground well, and each villa will have an additional 3,000-cubic-meter reserve water tank with pump.

Management services, such as 24-hour security, garbage collection and a gardening service, are to be provided at a monthly


rate of 13 baht per square meter of the respective lot.

The Eagles sang about another unorthodox use for mirrors but I'll be blowed if I shall waste lines over that subject on this





Gardening

FAWLTY FLOWERS s there anyone from the Western world who doesn't

like Fawlty Towers? What does that possibly have to with gardening? To be frank, nothing. I just like Fawlty Towers, that's all.

For the uninitiated, it's a British sitcom from the 1970s that is probably one of the most hilarious shows ever to appear on television. Sadly, they only made 12 episodes.

I don't suppose mentioning Spanish waiter Manuel saying "Ees not rat! Ees filigree Siberian hamster" will mean anything if you have not seen the show.

Or how about hotel-owner Basil shouting the following at an elderly lady with hearing difficulties who wouldn't turn on her hearing aid because it drains the batteries...

"Might I ask what you expected to see out of a Torquay hotel bedroom window? Sydney Opera House, perhaps? The Hanging Gardens of Babylon? Herds of wildebeest sweeping majestically..."

In one episode, the parents of a particularly obnoxious child apologized to Basil by saying, "He's highly strung," to which Basil replied under his breath, "He certainly should be."

Or his immortal lines, after a contretemps with some German guests, "Don't mention the war. I mentioned it once, but I think I got away with it." Classic stuff.

I could write about Fawlty Towers all day, but I ought to get to the inevitible tenuous link to something green that grows. I remember one episode in which Basil was chatting to the Major, and they were complaining about women. Basil remarked, "They have minds like Swiss cheese".

The Major responded with, "What, you mean hard?"

"No, full of holes," Basil replied.

Swiss cheese, surprisingly, is a plant that is abundant in Phuket. It doesn't take a master's degree in botany to figure out where its name came from. It's also known as the Mexican

breadfruit, ceriman or *monstera* deliciosa ("delicious monster"). In Thai, it's a hoo chang, or elephant's ear.

Let us start with what it is not. One of this plant's alternative names is the "split-leaved philodendron". But though it looks similar to a philodendron, it is actually a separate genus, so is not a philodendron at all. More on what a philodendron really is in the coming weeks.

The Swiss cheese plant has a thick stem that can grow up to 20 meters in height, and large, leathery, glossy, heart-shaped leaves that can be anything between 25 and 90 centimeters long by 25cm to 75cm broad.

On young plants the leaves start smaller and entire, with no lobes or holes, but older plants soon produce lobed and holed leaves. Those characteristic split edges and holes appear between the main lateral veins of the leaves.

The fruit is up to 25cm long and 3cm to 4cm in diameter, looking rather like a green ear of corn lined with hexagonal scales. Initially, the fruit contains so much oxalic acid that it is poisonous, and can cause immediate and painful blistering and irritation, swelling,

itching and even loss of voice. This makes the "delicious monster" epithet somewhat bizarre.

It takes a full year for the fruit to ripen, at which point it is safe to eat. Me, I'd rather not.

This plant abhors bright light. In fact, the young seedlings grow towards the darkest area they can find until they find a tree to latch onto, at which point they start to grow towards the light, creeping up the trunk.

There are 22 species in the genus, native to tropical rainforests from southern Mexico to Panama, and all are robust, strong-growing climbers, with thick, sparingly branched stems.

As the plant climbs, which it is eager to do, it puts out long pencil-thick aerial roots, many of which never reach the ground. Even though these verticallychallenged roots may look daft, don't cut them off, as they take in nutrients.

The plant is happiest in humus-rich soil, moist but well drained. Compost made from coconut husks that you see in white sacks outside every Phuket garden center is ideal. Propagation is easy – pinch a cutting from a neighbor (wear gloves, or those nasty oxalic acid crystals will get Fawlty Towers.

you) or use the air-layering method of a plastic bag of soil on the side of the stem.

If you decide to grow the Swiss cheese plant in a pot, the container needs adequate drainage holes, as it does require a lot of water and feeding. Before you put any soil in the pot, place a few shards of broken pot above the holes to allow the water to drain.

Monstera deliciosa is a popular houseplant in cooler parts of the world, typically in hotels, restaurants and offices, as well as in private homes. Even my mum has one of these things in her living room in the UK.

All it needs is a temperature between 20°C and 30°C (not really a problem in Phuket), high humidity and some shade. Flowering is rare when it is grown indoors, though.

How would Basil Fawlty have described this plant? He might well have reacted to it in the same way as he did to Sybil, his domineering wife, when she shouted, "Basil!"

"Yes, my little nest of vi-
