Phuket Airlines 'off ban list soon'

Air France helping to improve safety systems

BANGKOK: Phuket Airlines, recently blacklisted by the European Commission (EC) as one of 93 airlines barred from flying to the European Union (EU) and Switzerland, is confident that it will be reinstated soon, a senior official of the airline said on March 28.

As if to reinforce that confidence, the *Gazette* has learned that Phuket Airlines has applied to launch another airline, to be called Holiday Airlines. The application is currently being considered by the Thai Aviation Department (TAD).

Phuket Airlines was included in the EU ban list on safety grounds. It is one of only two airlines in East Asia banned, the other being North Korea's Air Koryo.

The European Commission (EC) has also advised passengers to avoid flying with the 93 airlines anywhere else in the world.

Grp Capt Pattana Tareekes, Phuket Air's Vice-President, Administration, told the *Gazette* in an exclusive interview, "We realize that safety is the most important part of being in the aviation business and we try to improve constantly.

"We are ready to let [EC inspectors] audit our aircraft and we have already let the Aviation Department invite the EC to conduct a safety audit.

"The EC list is to be revised every three months and we want to get off it as fast as possible; it

would be good if they could remove us earlier than that," Capt Pattana said.

"We are very sad that this has happened," he added, "because it has given us a negative image worldwide, and that has seriously affected our business."

However, the airline's management is not about to give up, he said. "We will prove that we are an international-standard airline and, when the EU team comes here, I believe we will pass their audit."

The TAD supports Phuket Airlines's contention that it should be removed from the blacklist.

Kanika Khemmawuthanond, the TAD's Deputy Director-General, told the *Gazette* that, after the airline was barred from the UK and the Netherlands, her department had ordered it to improve its safety, and had kept a close eye on it.

"Phuket Airlines has employed Air France to revamp all systems, especially those relating to safety, to bring them up to international standards. We have checked on progress and believe that the airline is now up to standard, and we have invited the EC to send inspectors to check.

"Unfortunately, at the time

when the papers were on their way to Europe, at the beginning of March, the 25 member-countries of EU were meeting [to decide which airlines should be included in the blacklist]."

She noted that Phuket Airlines' entry in the blacklist was marked by an asterisk, indicating that it would be audited soon to see whether it should be removed from the list.

"The EC knew that we were working to fix Phuket Airlines' safety systems – that is why they marked the entry with an asterisk.

"I cannot say for sure that the airline will pass the next audit, but the airline is ready for it and I believe we have done the best that we could – it should pass," K. Kanika added.

Referring to Phuket Airlines' application to register Holiday Airlines, she said, "The TAD committee is checking the documents now to decide whether to allow it or not. In fact, we are examining seven or eight such applications."

Capt Pattana declined to comment on the application.

Phuket Airlines began to have problems with its safety image in April last year, when passengers aboard one of its Boeing 747s bound for London forced a takeoff to be aborted after seeing fuel pouring from a wing tank after a refueling stop in Sharjah, in the United Arab Emirates.

Lawyer appeals against poll ban

PHUKET CITY: Lawyer Thavorn Permpoon, would-be District 1 candidate of the Thai Chuay Thai (Thais Help Thais, or TCT) Party, appealed to the Supreme Court after the Phuket Election Commission (PEC) ruled him out of the April 2 general election.

Speaking to the *Gazette* on March 23, he explained that the PEC had removed his name from the register for the elections on the grounds that he had not been a member of TCT for the obligatory minimum of 90 days.

He said that he was sur-

prised by the PEC's decision. "I have been a registered member of the party since March 23, 2005, and the party appointed me an honorary member on May 11, 2005," he said.

"The misunderstanding stems from when the PEC checked the party's membership list. Every party has to send to the registrar a list of any changes in membership.

"But when the PEC checked, they didn't see my name on the list because they were looking at the list of changes sent to them after December 31.

"Of course they didn't see my name there because I was already a member and didn't appear on the list of changes," he said.

K. Thavorn said that it was not fair that the PEC had announced the candidatures of his two rivals – Dr Sriyada Palimapan of the Thai Rak Thai Party and Pol Sgt Panya Borirak of the Pattana Chart Thai Party - without waiting for the outcome of his appeal, which was due to be heard on March 29.

The lawyer was a member of Phattalung's Provincial Council, and six years ago ran for a seat in the Senate, representing Phuket. He lost to the current incumbent, Paiboon Upatising.

Bypass road contractor raided

PHUKET CITY: A team of Crime Suppression Division officers, along with officials from the Phuket Provincial Industrial Office, on March 25 seized rockcrushing equipment belonging to Chiang Rai Harn Charoen Enterprise Co, the main contractor for the bypass road widening project.

The seizures took place following complaints that Harn Charoen had been crushing rock without a license to do so.

After 10 years, 'Battman' set to move on

PHUKET: James Batt, Joint Managing Director of Laguna Resorts & Hotels (LRH), will leave the island in June to take up a new post as the head of a chain of hotels headquartered in San Diego, California.

Mr Batt joined LRH in November 1995 and shortly after joining was promoted to Managing Director.

He told the Gazette, "We [long ago] made a family decision to return to the United States after 10 years in Phuket, and I received a call asking me to consider a position in San Diego.

"After they came here to see what I do in Phuket, and I went there to meet the team, I have accepted the position of President and Chief Operating Officer of Woodfin Suite Hotels."

Woodfin currently operates 17 hotels in 11 US states.

"The company has hotels across America, with new ones under development, including [properties on] Harbor Island in San Diego, and at Marina del Rey in Los Angeles," Mr Batt said. "The plan is to move the existing hotels up-market, and to become the major player in the upscale all-suites market."

Thus far, LRH has not said who will succeed Mr Batt.

Assassination gunman named

PHUKET: Police say they now know the identity of the gunman who assassinated Phuket businessman Preecha "Ko Noi" Kraitas, and are hunting him. They have named him as Samrerng Klaising, from Petchaburi.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pol Maj Gen Decha Budnampeth said that Samrerng and the man who drove the red BMW for him were believed to be "at large in Central Thailand".

Gov urges tax boss to chase Villa Santi

PHUKET CITY: Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura said two Dutch investors in the 800-million-baht Villa Santi project in Kalim could have their work permits renewed, but only for long enough to ensure that they pay some 11 million baht in income taxes supposedly owed on the hillside villa and hotel project.

Gov Udomsak called a meeting of provincial officials on March 27 to discuss the work permit status of Villa Santi investors Bart Duykers and Johannes Oranje, both from the Netherlands.

In attendance were several members of a provincial committee whose inspection of the project site in early February resulted in the developers being ordered to stop work. The committee members cited failure to obtain all the necessary building permits for the project, as their reason for ordering the stoppage.

However, it was revealed at new the work permits after the the meeting that rental villas do not require an Initial Environmental Examination (IEE), the lack of which was a main reason why the project was halted.

Nevertheless, the Governor said he would no longer authorize work permits for "clever" foreigners who come here "to exploit loopholes in the law for their own benefit, while destroying the Thai environment".

"Villa Santi can find other people to work here, and it doesn't matter if they are from the same country as these two men. I just don't want any more of these people who come here to cheat and destroy Thailand," he said.

Gov Udomsak urged all of the committee members present to look into ways to use existing laws to change the building codes at the provincial level so that this loophole could never be exploited

The Governor agreed to re-

Chief of the Phuket Provincial Revenue Office, Pensri Passakul, told him that Villa Santi was 11 million baht in arrears in its income taxes and that she feared that the two foreign investors might to try to use the fact that they had no work permits as a reason not to pay the tax.

The Governor agreed to extend their work permits until the end of their existing visas, which expire in April and May, but urged K. Pensri to move aggressively on the tax issue. He threatened to "take steps" to prevent the two from leaving the country if they failed to pay the overdue taxes.

When contacted, Mr Duykers told the Gazette that his work permit was in fact extended some hours before the meeting took

He added that he had not been contacted by any government agency regarding the tax

'We have very good relations with the government, so I don't see what the issue is," he added.

Boonchoke Maneechote. Chief of the Phuket Provincial Employment Office and one of those who attended the meeting, later told the Gazette that the work permits were renewed because neither of the two men had broken any labor laws.

flight was abandoned after it had to turn back to London with a hydraulics problem.

Phuket Airlines dumped its London route and attempted to switch instead to Amsterdam, but the Dutch authorities barred a flight from taking off after it was discovered that emergency lighting inside the aircraft was not working properly. There were also some questions over the pilot's papers.

In May, the airline was barred from Dutch and British airspace. In August it had an aircraft seized in South Korea for non-payment of airport fees, and in the same month it was barred from France.

By the end of August, Phuket Airlines had all but withdrawn from the international market, serving only one international route, between Bangkok and Yangon.

In September, one of its smaller aircraft skidded off the end of the runway at Tak airport, in northern Thailand. No one was injured, but one passenger, Senator Udon Tantisunthorn, suggested the crash might have been caused by pilot error. "If you ask me," he said, "the plane should have touched down at the beginning of the runway rather than around the middle of it."

Patong assault victim dies

PATONG: Chatchai "Ghee" Ritchohor, 32, who fell into a coma after being head-butted by a foreign tourist in July last year, has died.

K. Ghee's younger sister, K. Oranuch, said her brother died on March 25 of long-term complications from emergency brain surgery performed at Vachira Phuket Hospital after the assault, which caused his brain to hemorrhage and swell.

Doctors in K. Ghee's native Nong Khai Province listed the causes of death as Hepatitis B infection, pneumonia and peritonitis, she said.

The assault on K. Ghee occurred after a darts match outside the Piccadilly Pub on Soi Kebsup.


Scotsman Tommy Hunter admitted to head-butting K. Ghee, but said in an email to the Gazette that he was acting in selfdefense and that he hoped K. Ghee would recover.

Kathu Police police issued a warrant for Hunter's arrest but by that time he had already left the country.

Pol Lt Pateuang Fonmanat of Kathu Police Station told the Gazette on March 27 that he was unaware of K. Ghee's death.

He added, "Hunter faces a charge of committing bodily harm but if the victim's relatives report [K. Ghee's death] to us and there is medical evidence that he died as a result of that bodily harm, we can amend the charge [to manslaughter]."





An essential tool for selling tourism to the world, particularly Europe, is the annual International Tourism Bourse, or ITB, in Berlin. This year representatives from Phuket, Krabi and Phang Nga went there in force. As Sangkhae Leelanapaporn and Natcha Yuttaworawit report, they came back full of hope that the 2006-2007 high season will be exceptionally good.

ourism business people from Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi returned recently from the ITB exhibition in Berlin, the world's largest travel show, highly optimistic at prospects for the 2006-2007 high season, starting in November this year.

The only threat to a boom year appears to be the dearth of direct international flights to Phuket; travel agencies in Europe seem no longer concerned about continuing violence in the Deep South, having accepted that it is confined to the three provinces bordering Malaysia.

At the show, most of the questions about safety concerned the possibility of another tsunami hitting the Andaman Coast and continuing political uncertainty in Bangkok.

Some 60 businesses from Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi set up booths at the ITB, held from March 8 to 12. The first three

days were for trade visitors, while the final two days were open to the public.

Many of these businesses then went on to Stockholm and Copenhagen, the Swedish and Danish capitals, to promote tourism to Scandinavians.

Phuket Tourist Association President Pattanapong Aikwanich told the *Gazette* that feedback was good at ITB this year, with higher-than-expected numbers of travel agents and individual tourists visiting the Phuket booths.

No one asked about the violence in the Deep South but, instead, people quizzed the Thais about politics and protests in Bangkok, he said.

"We told them that there was nothing to worry about; the protests had been going on for some time but had consisted entirely of rhetoric, with no sign of violence.

"Nobody seemed too concerned about the political situa-

tion, but many asked about the earthquakes that have been detected not too far away in the Andaman Sea. We were able to tell them that we have a good system of warning towers that will give people time to evacuate safely. However not that many people asked about this," he added.

He said the top four sources of tourists for Phuket are currently Australia, South Korea, Germany and Sweden.

"The Japanese also want to come to Phuket, but there is still a problem with direct flights. This is different from South Korea – there are many direct flights from there, and Koreans like to come to Phuket.

"In Swedish eyes, Thai people are heroes because of the way they helped after the tsunami. Many Swedish people died, but Thai people were generous and helpful to survivors. I asked many Swedish travel agents about this and always got the same answer, that the image of Thai people is very positive.

"Luckily, there are still many direct charter flights from Scandinavia to Phuket. We do have a problem with getting tourists from Japan, Australia and Singapore after [Thai Airways International

- TG] canceled many important direct routes. We understand that TG could not make a profit on those services [after the tsunami]. We don't know how to fix this problem. It still seems that there is no chance of those flights being resurrected," K. Pattanapong added.


Poomiphat Navnukroh, General Manager of the Cape Panwa Hotel, told the *Gazette* that booths in "Thailand Hall" at ITB attracted more travel agents and tourists than any other.

He said that this was his third visit to ITB, and that feedback this year had been good.

"We signed many contracts with travel agents and made appointments with others," he said. Whereas in the past Cape Panwa had done a lot of business with British agents, this year he had signed new business with agents

from Germany and other North European countries.

ITB had been a good show for the hotel, he said. "In November I believe we will get more tourists from the Scandinavian market. Our occupancy since last November has averaged about 70%, which was not as good as 2004 [before the tsunami]. Some tourist markets still have not returned, such as the Asian markets, which are still concerned about political turmoil in Thailand and the continuing earthquakes around [Sumatra]," he added.

He noted that modern communications and the media allow news to spread very fast. If the Asian tourists do not return, he said, that could mean danger ahead for tourism in Phuket.

He, too, had received complaints about flights. "Some agents complained that [direct] flights to Phuket are always full, or that there are not enough flights."

K. Poomiphat was impressed with the resurgence in tourists from Scandinavia. "Kata and

Karon Beaches are full of tourists from Scandinavian, which is a surprise, given that so many people from there lost relatives in the tsunami.

"That is especially true for the Swedish; the population of Sweden is about 8 million, and about 300,000 of those have come to Phuket since November 2005, staying mostly in hotels in Kata and Karon. Swedish tour agents expect Phuket to be the top tourist destination for Swedes for several years to come," he added.

The President of Krabi Tourism Association, Itirit Kinglek, told the *Gazette*, "There are 20 travel agencies from Krabi [at ITB], and the response has been rather good because the perception of Southeast Asia, including Thailand, is improving.

"Our tourists are almost exclusively from northern Europe. No one asked about the possibility of another tsunami and tourists said that they are not worried about the political situation as long as it is non-violent."

He added, "In 2004, before the tsunami, we had about 1.8 million tourists. In 2005 that decreased to 1.03 million tourists. But I think this high season the number of tourists will increase by about 20% from last year.

As for Koh Phi Phi Don, he agreed that there had been some problems about government rules for rebuilding accommodation.

But he believed those prob-

lems could be overcome. "By the end of this year, I believe Phi Phi will be able to support tourism, though not 100% as before.


In the first three months of this year, hotels in Krabi averaged 70% to 80% occupancy, he said. "The next high season will be better. We plan to do road shows to target new markets, including Russia and Hong Kong, and we will also go to the Arabian Travel Mart in Dubai.

"Our idea is to keep expanding into new markets. We think Krabi's tourism will improve so long as there is no effect from political problems."

His counterpart in Phang Nga, Anupong Sa-Nguannam, agreed that ITB had been useful. "The feedback at ITB was good and will help Khao Lak because European tour agents met many tourism businesses from Khao Lak. They trust us and will put the name of Khao Lak back into their brochures.

"Tourists who visited out booths did not seem worried about another tsunami – they see it as a natural event that happens only rarely. They seem more worried about the safety on the roads. Some asked about Thai politics, but I don't believe it is an important factor for tourism."

"After the tsunami, the number of rooms in Khao Lak was cut to about 20%, but now we are back to about 70% or 80%. We have had some problems getting labor for construction. Workers from Isarn do not want to come to Khao Lak, possibly because they are afraid of another tsunami. It's expensive to use foreign labor because government registration fees are so high. That is the reason we have been slow in rebuilding."

Pupé said he was surprised at the depth of his own emotions: "I feel strange. I love her, and we're so close – as if in a former existence we were lovers."

Although Thais, especially rural Thais, traditionally regard dogs as unclean – as sinners from a past life forced to go on four legs in this life – Pupé feels no animadversion toward Olé's present canine status.

"At the same time, little Olé undeniably loves and is close to Pupé," said Uncle Gik.

"He came, apologizing formally, and tendered 999 baht as a bride price, begging to marry my dog," Gik said.

"I accepted it, because I could see he was being honest. He agreed to take care of her, to feed and shelter her. We arranged a marriage party, then went to make merit, bringing along food for hungry children."

Since then, the old man explained, his new, er, son-in-law shows every sign of being smitten by the blushing bride: "He buys expensive toothpaste to brush her teeth and food supplements to make her fur glow. They spend their time fondly hugging and kissing."

Uncle Gik said news of Olé and Pupé's wedding elicited considerable consternation among neighbors in the village: "They say it's unnatural," he said, "and impossible for man and dog to live together as husband and wife."

Regarding the latter issue, Chiang Mai's chief veterinary officer in the Provincial Livestock office, Dr Somporn Pornwisetkul agreed with villagers.

"Such a thing seems impossible," he said, "because men and dogs are wholly different. As far as their sexual relations go, I don't think there will be any offspring: the two anatomies differ greatly."

He did not, however, rule out the possibility. Asked whether he felt Olé suffered during the sexual congress, Dr Somporn begged not to offer an opinion.

Assistant Professor Dr Pairat Preuksachat-Kunakorn, described as an expert in psychiatry, said regarding the couple's psychological state that "many factors may figure."

"Psychological testing must be performed first, but I would say on the face of it that [this] is somewhat unusual," he averred.

He noted that "such behavior can be either long-term or temporary," and suggested "a responsible elder go talk [with Pupé] so he understands the consequences, especially the social consequences" of marrying a dog.

Poodles, it should be noted, range tremendously in size. The relative statures of Olé and Pupé were not reported.



Pornthip to investigate 300 bodies

unying Pornthip Rojanasunand, Director of the Justice Ministry's Forensic Science Institute, said she would investigate a recently-discovered burial site in Pattani Province, where about 300 corpses have been discovered.

A large majority do not appear to have died from natural causes, she said.

Khunying Pornthip did not specify the exact location where the corpses were found, but local rescue workers from the Por Tek Tung Rescue Foundation said they believed she was referring to a section of the Talubok Cemetery in Pattani's Muang District, where unclaimed bodies from Pattani, Yala and Narathiwat are buried.

The officer, who asked not to be named, said most of the bodies were foreign fishermen working on Thai-owned trawlers in Pattani.

Khunying Pornthip said she was alarmed that there were no police records to account for the bodies, which were not dumped in a mass grave, but placed individually in the ground without coffins.

Police normally record such deaths as part of standard operating procedure, she said.

It would be another month before her team could conduct any autopsies at the site, she added.

Cool crockery: Researchers from the National Metal and Materials Technology Center and Thammasat University have jointly developed what they call "The Food Plate", an edible plate made of food-grade cassava root powder.

As he died on duty, Sgt Maj Insom could be considered for a posthumous promotion, Gen Jirut added.


Botch-ulism: Following a botulism outbreak in Nan's Navai Mai village, military and health officials want to learn how the botulism bacteria could be used to make a deadly toxin, Thailand Health Minister Pinij Jarusombat said.

The outbreak occurred after 161 villagers became ill from eating contaminated bamboo shoots at a merit-making cer-

After some of the victims were flown to Bangkok for treatment, K. Pinij told a press conference the mass poisoning provided a rare opportunity to study clostridium botulinum. The bacterium is used to produce botulinum toxin, one of the most poisonous substances known to

The overnment agencies would study the process of producing biological weapons from the bacteria in order to prepare for its use in a possible terror attack, he added.

ith the next Full Moon Party on Koh Pha-ngan co-inciding with the Songkran New Year festival, the Samui Harbor Department is planning special patrols to boost maritime safety in the area.

Lopburi Yothasiri, the head of the island's Harbor Office, recently announced the imminent arrival of a 130-foot patrol vessel with more than 10 crew, which will check boats arriving at and leaving Koh Samui and Koh Phangan, as well those encountered at sea nearby.


"Our staff will check passenger numbers on every boat," said K. Lopburi, "and we will engage extra staff from Surat Thani to lend a hand. During big festivals like this it is important to make sure tourists are safe. The new boat will be patroling from April 12 to 17."

As for speedboats arriving and leaving the Full Moon party itself, although the harbor police have already conducted inspections to ensure that all such vessels comply with safety standards, K. Lopburi also wants passengers to be informed of the potential risks before they board.

"A lot of problems can occur when people are drunk and lose control on a boat," he said. "If tourists know the risks before they board, they can look after themselves better. If the boat is too full they should just wait for another one."

Some 15 people died, six of them tourists, when a speedboat hit a rock after a Full Moon Party on January 25, 2005. Since then, the Harbor Department has been working to increase safety on tourist boats in the area.

No political fallout: Recent reports in the Thai press suggested

that tourism figures in major destinations such as Phuket and Chiang Mai have been hit by the current political crisis.

Panu Woramit, the head of the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) on Koh Samui, says the island has not suffered at all, however. According to the TAT, Samui's tourist numbers so far have matched and may even exceed expectations this year.

"Last month, the island reached 90% occupancy," said

K. Woramit, "and although the peak tourist season generally ends in March on Samui, bookings are still high for April – especially over the Songkran holiday period."

It would appear that neither

political nor natural disasters can deter visitors from coming to Koh Samui – although some local commentators have been warning that a massive increase in development and construction on the island might do so.

Tsunami boost: According to figures recently released by Surat Thani Provincial Commerce Officer, Sompong Aonprasert, the December 26, 2004, tsunami brought about a significant increase in commercial and residential registrations on Samui during 2005.

The number of applications for juristic person registration in the province rose by 20% last year, with 1,300 applications for company registration and 310 partnership registrations – representing an overall capital investment of 3.5 billion baht.

Koh Samui accounted for the lion's share of business reg-

istrations, with 1,199 applications filed on the island compared with 178 registrations in Surat Thani's Muang district and 113 on Koh Pha-ngan.

Developers head south: With the property sector still booming on Samui, developers are now targeting more remote areas such as beach areas in the south of the island.

Large, exclusive residential projects along the southwest coast near Baan Taling Ngam are attracting particular attention and investment, both regionally and internationally. Thanks largely to the unspoilt surroundings, agents say that high-end properties in this area could fetch as much as US\$2.5 million (100 million baht) per home.

Up-market residential developments also attract services such as restaurants, bars and recreational facilities. According to one local developer, areas once seen as agricultural backwaters may soon be competing for the title of "the Park Lane of Samui".

Intelligent offices: A second high-tech office building on Koh Samui, known as "IT Complex II", is scheduled for completion by the end of the year. It will be six stories high with 4,700 square meters of office space, and the units will incorporate a number of technological benefits that the developers say mark a move toward more sophisticated business communications on the island.

The new IT Center will house property-related businesses such as real estate agents, lawyers, architects, construction firms and interior designers.


Facilities will include 10MB hi-speed broadband Internet with ISP satellite backup, ISDN telephone lines and full generator backup for electrical equipment. There will even be an onsite helipad

The first IT complex opened two years ago, causing controversy because of its urban design, which many people felt was inappropriate for an island.

But the Samui Estate Corpo, sole agent for the IT Complex II, believes the new building is essential for the island.

"The digital future of Koh Samui is progressing due to international demand," a spokesman said. "The intelligent office is a must for the island in order to increase the efficiency of our businesses."



s Phuket's population and economy grows, the amount of garbage produced on the island also increases inexorably.

Some visitors to these shores might be forgiven for scratching their heads in disbelief and asking, "Where on earth are the bottle banks and the recycling dumps?"

The ironic fact of the matter is that, in Thailand, the idea of separating, recycling and reusing garbage occurs more readily to the poor – out of sheer necessity - whereas the concept seems hard to grasp for the average middle-class and professional

While municipalities struggle to dispose of the ever-growing tonnage of trash on the island fast solutions are required.

In Thailand, the *samlor* or rot sa-leng - a motorcycle and sidecar – carrying Thailand's equivalent of the long-disappeared British rag and bone man – is a familiar sight. This happy chappy relieves householders of discarded glass and plastic bottles, paper, long-broken-down household appliances and anything else that can be recycled.

Unfortunately, there is no way that these junk merchants can handle Phuket's current garbage problem – up to 470 tons a day by some estimates. Enter

The Niti-gritty of recycling

company dedicated to separating and recycling used materials.

The Phuket branch of Wongpanit is run by 28-year-old Phuket native Niti Ruktaetrakul. A computer management graduate, K. Niti admits that the business is in his blood; he has always had a tendency to keep things rather than throw them away.

He therefore took a course at the Wongpanit factory in Phitsanuloke after graduating and obtained a business franchise to run a separation plant in Phuket. K. Niti eventually found an ideal plot of land close to Dents Done, on Phra Phuket Kaew Rd in Kathu, and set up business in December 2004.

K. Niti explains, "After finishing the training course, I learned that the Phuket Municipality incinerator had more garbage than it could handle and that was a very good start indeed. In point of fact, we are not a recycling factory; our company separates usable materials and prepares them for the larger recycling factories around Bangkok and Chon Buri.

We classify the main types of reusable material into five main groups: paper, non-ferrous metal, ferrous metal [iron and steel], glass and plastic. We also deal with electronic parts and batteries."

K. Niti is also consultant to a smaller Wongpanit branch in Thalang District. He points out that Phuket is a growing province and that soon even districts like Rawai will need a separation plant.

And the rag pickers with their samlor? Has Wongpanit put them out of business? Quite the contrary. They now collect for the plant. Still, K. Niti encourages local communities to separate at source. He has also introduced two consciousness-raising projects, called "Usable Garbage Bank" and "Usable Garbage Market".

"Basically, for the Usable

Garbage Fair, we choose a place, usually a school, where people can bring their used materials.

He adds that he has run this project at about 20 local schools so far and that he expects more to take part in the scheme.

The school records what materi-

als the students have brought in

and when we come to collect the

garbage we pay students accord-

"As for the Usable Garbage Market, we provide a location then inform locals that we're there to buy their recyclable garbage off them. We've had about five occasional garbage markets so far, but we also have a regular one, twice a month, in Moo Baan Kathu, on Soi 4."

Predictably enough, Wongpanit's main source of usable materials is Phuket City Municipality's incinerator, which provides about 17% of the plant's overall materials.

K. Niti explains, "I'm planning to introduce a plastic disposal process that would, in effect, grind the plastic down to manageable size.

"The problem is that we have to follow a lot of environmental rules and the process is not only very noisy, but also requires a lot of water.

"For the Municipality, their biggest disposal problem is getting rid of polystyrene and they'd prefer us to tackle that."





S ince the institution of a constitutional monarchy in 1932, Thailand has suffered more than a few attempts by strongmen to create a totalitarian state. Some lasted longer than others, but eventually the people's fierce independence has always won.

A stalwart group of veteran politicians – many of whom were mere children in 1932 – remain, offering sage counsel and opinions to younger generations.

Sakul Na Nakorn, who is now 84, is one of those elder statesmen. The recent recipient of a Pridi Banomyong Foundation Award, he recorded his experiences and views in his book *Tam Roy Prawattisart Tee Yung Mee Lom Hai Jai* – or *On the Trail of Living, Breathing History*.



He spoke with the Gazette's

akul Na Nakorn was born in Phuket on October 23, 1921, the son of Chuan and Kham, and studied first at Plookpanya School and then at Phuket Wittayalai School.

He says that the most significant event in his life was his separation from his extended family when, as an adolescent, he and his family accompanied his father – a government financial control-

ler – to Bangkok. There, he continued his studies at Wang Somdej Burapa School.

Subdued for a moment, K. Sakul explained that his mother and younger brothers came back to Phuket, but that he decided to stay with his father in Bangkok.

He said, "But I also felt I needed to be in Phuket – that, as the eldest child of three, I had a responsibility to be the man of the house in Phuket. But I also knew that I had to study to improve myself.

"My intention was to study at Thammasat University, although I missed my mother – now back in Phuket – so much. I also wanted to help her; she was raising the other children more or less on her own."

He decided instead to study at Changkon Pathumwan – a

technical college also in Bangkok – undertaking a three-year course. "It was not too long a course, so I knew I would be back home soon," he said.

The years passed, and K. Sakul graduated from Changkon Pathumwan on December 7, 1941 – the date now infamous for the Japanese raid on Pearl Harbor. He returned to Phuket, and soon took up a post with the Mine and Rubber Co at Takua

Pa, Phang Nga. There he met Naree Tanthonghe. They married and are still together after 61 years. The devoted couple raised four sons and a daughter.

Naree once saved him from assassin's bullet by standing between him and his wouldbe killer. The gun-

man ran away.

Democracy has always been a concern of his, even when he was just 11 years old, during the country's move to a constitutional monarchy in 1932.

"In 1932, we fought against power that was undemocratic. 'Power corrupts' was our rallying cry.

"Times change, however, and what was once simply the lust for power for its own sake became also a lust for power for monetary gain. The problems that

stem from wanting power became twofold," he asserts.

"Democracy is a simple concept: it must increase the quality of life for all people in all strata of society."

In 1947, he became a surveyer with the Kamala Tin Dredging Co. Living in company accommodation, he saw first hand the difference in lifestyle and pay between foreigners and Thais. Two years later, these differences came to a head when K. Sakul was one of the leaders of a strike by employees. The company caved in to all their demands.

In 1952, while still working in the tin industry, he and some friends set up Pak Tai, Thailand's first local newspaper outside Bangkok. He continued to write for the newspaper for 30 years, building a reputation as a clean and honest journalist.

His writing made him some powerful enemies. For example when he wrote in great detail about the massive profits tin companies were making from processing ore bought cheap from local people, the column caused a backlash that resulted in lower profits for the tin companies.

In 1956, K. Sakul was elected kamnan of Rassada and also joined the provincial council, in those days an advisory body appointed by the Provincial Governor. He served six terms on the council, stepping down in 1985.

By that time, the former tin mine surveyor had turned against his old profession. Seeing thie rise of tourism and its potentially wide benefits to society, he campaigned against tin.

He was at the forefront of the protest against the opening of a tantalum factory on the outskirts of Phuket Town, a protest that ended with the plant being burned

K. Sakul is now a consultant to the governor of Phuket, a role he first undertook with the first CEO Governor, Pongpayome Vasaputi, and which he con-

tinues with the current Governor, Udomsak Uswarangkura.

"Some of my suggestions have been taken up and it is gratifying to see them come to fruition for the benefit of all who live in Phuket. However, as time passes, the views of the 'older' people such as myself tend to be seen in a more negative light."

K. Sakul said, "I have always been more concerned with people than material wealth. But there are parallels between business and governance.

"Phuket's multi-track development plan is a number of threads woven together. For example, the development of the island's economy goes hand-inhand with its social development, both of which are in line with the strategy for the nation as a whole.

"The local governor implements the plans and if successful, he is rewarded for it; business and the province are more successful and all benefit."

Each path to success, he believes, has many smaller paths feeding into it "like the tributaries of a mighty river, such as the Orinoco. It is because of these smaller paths that so much care must be taken; they must all be examined. Even the smallest of these offshoots must be checked, for they are just as important as the main path."

He extends his analogy to the people within society. "Most people progress through life along the main path, although some – for many reasons, not necessarily of their own doing - are on different paths.


"Take the poor, for example. We may see them on the street, and it is easier sometimes to look away from them, but we should not walk on by without considering them and what can be done for them.

'Can a society, an individual within society, claim to be successful if it, or he, ignores those less fortunate or able? This is one of the guiding tenets of my life."

Plainly a man of strong convictions, he says that he has five mottoes for life: 1. Know your strengths; 2. Be satisfied with what you are and have; 3. Be confident; 4. Exercise self control; 5. Respect yourself.

Of the current political turmoil, K. Sakul said, "It is impossible for me to predict what the outcome will be, but one thing I am sure of is that all the struggling our nation is seeing is democracy in action."

famous remark – of ten attributed to Brian Eno – about The Velvet Underground (VU) is that while only a few thousand people bought a VU album upon its initial release, almost every single one of them was inspired to start a band.

An exaggeration, undoubtedly, but one that goes some way to suggest the strength of the band's influence and the cult following it garnered then, and which exists even today, 40 years later.

Formed in 1965, VU rapidly became part of the hedonistic, avante-garde New York scene. Perhaps not surprisingly, the band soon came to the attention of painter, filmmaker, publisher and actor Andy Warhol, arguably the leading light of the Pop Art move-

Warhol became VU's manager and secured for the band by this time comprising Lou Reed, John Cale, Sterling Morrison and Maureen Tucker – a contract with Verve Records. He also suggested that the stunning Christa Päffgen, the model, actress and icon, better known as Nico, sing with VU.

Warhol's suggestions soon became insistence. He demanded that Nico sing with VU on their debut album, The Velvet Underground and Nico, which he produced, apart from one song, Sunday Morning.

The album was recorded in one or two days in November 1966, and released in March budget-price CD from Polydor.

Underground resurrection

The album cover is famous for its typically Warholian design: a bright yellow banana with "Peel Slowly and See" printed on the early versions near a perforated

Those who did remove the banana skin sticker found a pink, phallic, peeled banana beneath. Rumors that the sticker was impregnated with LSD were untrue.

While the American west coast was undergoing its Summer of Love, psychedelia, flower power and hippy phase, and The Beatles were only just playing the counter-culture game, VU concerned themselves with altogether darker subject matter: transvestites, heroin addiction, alienation and sadomasochism – an appropriate east coast alternative.

Eleven songs from VU's debut showcase their style and range – only two of which do not feature on The Velvet Underground Gold - on a two-disc

from the band's three albums and two out-take compilation and live albums, including four "slightly" raucous live tracks that most other compilations have shied away

Gold also includes two Nico solo tracks - Chelsea Girls and It Was A Pleasure Then - cowritten and played by VU band members Lou Reed, John Cale and Sterling Morrison, and taken from her 1967 debut album, Chelsea Girl.

The tracks from VU's de-

but album careen from the pounding I'm Waiting For The Man to the often misinterpreted Sunday Morning, and from the droning Venus In Furs and Heroin to the bitter Femme Fatale - written about socialite and Warhol muse Edie Sedgwick, and sung by Nico.

The overall sound is driven by Reed's deadpan vocals, Cale's droning – occasionally shrieking – viola, Morrison's often R&B and country-influenced guitar and Tucker's hypnotically simple drumming. And, of course,

Nico's husky, almost frosty Teutonic voice.

Though not a commercial or critical success upon release, the album, often known as The Banana Album, is now regarded as one of the greatest ever. In 1998, Q Magazine readers voted it the 71st greatest album of all time; in 2003, TV network VH1 placed it at Number 19. Rolling Stone placed it at Number 13 on its 500 Greatest Albums list.

Gold progresses with notable tracks – there are only six on the original album anyway – from the 1968 release White Light/ White Heat.

Included are the title track and all 17 minutes and 27 seconds of Sister Ray – the improvised murder tale, a mini-opera really, based on some of Reed's near-perennial song motifs: violence, drug abuse, homosexuality and transvestism. Not for the faint-hearted.

Also from *White Light*... is the free-jazz/grunge *I Heard Her* Call My Name, which features guitar work from Reed considered by many to be his finest to date. The grungy distortion is so heavily multi-layered that not much else is audible in the track. Although this style is now common in rock music, the song is still recognized as one of the best examples of this technique.

The remainder of this compilation covers the years up to 1970's Loaded, VU's last "proper" album – 1973's Squeeze featured replacement bassist/keyboardist Doug Yule and Maureen Tucker, plus session musicians. By this time, the volatile forces and personalities within VU there had by this time been numerous personnel changes caused the band to separate.

any adjectives are used in spa reviews with "relaxing", healthy" and "holistic" being just three. But how many of these words really ring true in a spa experience?

Sri Panwa Spa


I was determined to find out and so went to Sri Panwa Phuket with an open mind and a serious desire to be pampered like a princess.

This boutique villa hotel, part of the uipscale Sri Panwa property development, features accommodation and treatment rooms in an elegant combination of tropical contemporary and traditional Phuket-style décor.

It was quite a climb up to the hotel's spa, but once on top the view of Panwa Bay and the easterly sweep across Phang Nga Bay was magnificent.

Seriously pampered





Sri Panwa's mobile massage beds mean you can be pampered while looking out at your favorite view, whether hillside or sea.

There are two treatment rooms with four spa massage beds and five therapists to handle your every need and – here's the lovely touch – Sri Panwa has "mobile massage beds" – 10 of them in fact, so you can have a poolside massage or a massage in your room.

I was greeted by Saowarot Khunsong, the Spa Co-ordinator, who immediately put me at my ease with a traditional *wai* and a herbal drink.

K. Saowarot explained that the spa uses exclusively natural Thai herbs in its wide range of treatments, featuring, amongst others, the three 'R's – the Rejuvenation package, a Romance treatment and a Relaxing session

Just to be on the safe side, I chose the full body massage, called the "Sri Panwa Serenity".

This is a one-hour treatment and costs 2,000 baht.

K. Neung, my therapist, lived up to her name (*neung* means "Number 1" in Thai) starting with a heavenly foot massage.

The treatment room provided sound-and-vision therapy in itself with its ambient music and aquamarine blue walls and before I knew it, K. Neung was easing into a body massage starting, of all places, with my stomach, for a five-minute rub "to help digestion" she explained.

Next was a one-hour 1,900-

baht Sabai Facial Treatment. K. Neung explained, "We use specific herbs for different types of skin along with yogurt to cleanse and feed the pores.

Tamarind is a natural moisturizer and honey heals and repairs any blemishes.

"In addition an oatmeal treatment reduces and closes any fine lines to make you look younger."

K. Neung gently rubbed cool yogurt into my face to remove any cosmetics or dirt and then applied a tamarind and milk powder scrub followed by a honey massage.

After deep cleansing my face with cucumber, she applied an oatmeal-and-yogurt face mask. A final cleansing and then she rubbed in a jasmine-scented moisturizer.

All of this may sound a little messy but the end result after an hour was a smooth, clean skin.


I felt absolutely wonderful afterwards.

Capannina

he hills are most certainly alive with the sound of music tonight, although Julie Andrews doesn't even get a look in. The soundtrack to the drive from there to here – and every car journey needs a good soundtrack – is none other than the Pet Shop Boys' *Please* album.

This music takes us back to ... well, longer ago than either I or my dining companion at first wish to recall.

A certain sense of disbelief momentarily descends as we determine that it's more than two decades since the synth-pop sublimity of the opening track *Two Divided By Zero* and then *West End Girls* first caught our attention.

"Mais ou sont les neiges d'antan?" we ejaculate simultaneously, wondering also where have all the flowers gone and where do you go to my lovely, before finding where the streets have no name.

Another wrong turning.

However, a blessing of good karma arrives in the form of a goslow by some gloriously lobsterpink tourists, who are merrily ambling down the middle of the road oblivious to a vehicle approaching them as if the Devil himself was tapping at the rear window.

"That's a good sign," says my companion as I am forced to slow from 100kmh to zero in sinus-hurting time.

She points out the C-A-P of Capannina, tonight's destination for the West End Girl and self.

The tires screech – as tires are wont to do – as I fling the car sideways, dispersing yet more tourists and the odd security guard through the gentle flashing of the car's headlights, the stabbing of the horn as if it were the "Fire" button on a Typhoon's control column and the uttering of – in my best South African accent – a number of slurred ethnic slurs.

Incidentally, the turning is off Kata Rd down a small soi to Phuket Kata Resort; La Capannina is opposite the entrance to the hotel, and a number of parking spaces exist.

La Capannina is the brainchild of the robust yet reserved Mario Eleonori from the Italian Adriatic Coast town of Montecassiano, which is not to be confused with Monte Cassino, inland of the Mediterranean Coast. Mario arrived in Phuket in 2000,

fresh from having run a cooking school in the seaside town.

Cooking has, he happily admits, always been his passion – and the particular peculiarity of this passion is pizza. Many of Phuket's Italian pizza cognoscenti – the Pizzarati? – declare Mario's pies the peak, the very apotheosis of the genre. Consider that a gauntlet thrown down to the rest of the island's pizza purveyors.

The original La Capannina was hemmed in by four walls, and although the food was – and remains – first-class, the alfresco version, opened in November 2004, gained much in the way of ambiance by losing the walls.

La Capannina when we arrive; the clientèle made up — unsurprisingly—of Italian and other Euro tourists and expats; the restaurant's reputation extends far beyond Kata, with the Pizzarati traveling from all points of the compass, even from the mainland, to savor the fare of Mario's culinary savoir-faire.

Drinks first, however, and white seems right for the night. Mario breaks open a Planeta La Segreta Bianco, which is a bit of a snip at 1,600 baht a bottle.

It offers a rich, fruity bouquet of mango and lychee, with a hint of mint and a peppering of er... pepper. The taste is nicely balanced and dry. Mario does

know his stuff, stocking a pleasingly replete wine cellar and deli.

La Capannina is the only place I have found in Phuket serving locally-produced mozzarella, made from Thai buffalo milk and a feature of the *insalata Caprese*. With typical perversity, we decide on neither this nor pizza tonight. Having enjoyed them both numerous times before, we sally forth into the rest of the menu.

It's no exaggeration to say that, despite the obvious effort he lavishes on his food, his talent is as natural as the pattern made by the dust on a butterfly's wings.

Beginning with bruschetta pomodoro (90 baht), insalata

rucola 180 (baht) and carpaccio – 350 baht for a plate the size of a cricket pitch. Having jointly devoured the beef sliced to mere microns thick that has evanesced in our mouths, we're left wondering just how we are going to cram in all the other delights on offer tonight.

Quick-witted conversation between my dining companion and myself. We discuss the concept that the test of a first-rate intelligence is the ability to hold two diametrically opposed ideas in mind at the same time and still retain the ability to function. This, plus the pleasure of listening to the myriad conversations in a handful of Romance languages, causes suitable pauses between courses.

A goodly time later – the super Mario does not rush his *patroni* – he asks what we would like for our main courses. Milady is being mercurial over her choice, but finally gives Mario her order: *gnocchi* with salmon, the sauce to be his choice. As has often been noted, I am far easier and choose *ravioli burro e salvia* for 200 baht.

Mario's sauce for the *gnoc-chi* (350 baht) is bolstered by a healthy shot of vodka, the essence of which adds bite to the rich satiny sauce. My ravioli, stuffed with spinach and with a butter, sage and Parmesan sauce, is simple and simply divine. Do I really need to state that the pasta and *gnocchi* is homemade? No? Good.

We then share a dreamy dessert – tortino caldo al cioccolato con gelato all vaniglia (warm chocolate cake with creamy chocolate filling) – before continuing on our long day's journey into night to the sounds of the Pet Shop Boys.

he smallest craft in the "S" line – Azimut's Open range – together with the 62S, was presented at last year's Genoa International Boat Show. The Avigliana boatyard in Turin has achieved an exceptional goal: a new, four-model range, from 43 feet to 86ft, in just three years.

Another unique "open" design by Stefano Righini, the 43 Open has distinct living and sleeping quarters that. With a perfect balance of openings and windows, it combines the commodiousness and elegance of a flybridge with the sporty freshness of an open.

Extensive industrial developments have been taking place in Avigliana over the past two years, leading to a more technology-driven process that delivers higher quality and a marked increase in production.

The 43S has a squared-off prow that not only enlarges all the deck areas, but also improves mooring maneuvers. The foredeck has its own large sunpad, with cushions and glass rests in Plexiglas. It is easily reached via the wide walk-around decks, protected by sturdy steel handrails, Water supply filler caps are to starboard and fuel supply filler caps are on both sides.

The cockpit, reached by a starboard gangway, has a six-seat U-shaped cushioned sofa, with storage cupboards underneath, and a central table that, when lowered, has its own cushion – transforming the divan into a very comfortable sun lounger. The door leading to the dinette has

four sliding crystal-glass panels. When fully opened, each panel slides over the other to create a large open-plan living space that unites the dinette and cockpit.

The engine room can be reached via a hatch under the sofa in the cockpit or from another in the floor of the saloon.

The air-conditioning system and the generator are in the auxiliary area. Ventilation is guaranteed by two fans and an extractor. The batteries are high-current and rapid-charging. Engine exhausts are below the waterline.

The 43S is the first Azimut to be fitted with the new IPS 500 system, developed by Volvo. This delivers exceptional maneuverability and is very quiet during cruising. The twin 370hp Volvo engines give the same performance as obtained from a traditional 450hp engine – maximum speed 33 knots and a cruising speed of 29 knots – while consuming far less fuel.

The two engines also offer a significant reduction in exhaust fumes, putting them well within IMO (International Maritime Organization) gas emission rules.

The internal décor, designed by the renowned Carlo Galeazzi in collaboration with Azimut's styling department, is modern and refined. The exceptional luminosity granted by the large windows is enhanced by shades made of high-tech fabrics and by the interwoven fibers used on the door paneling to the cabins and wardrobes. This contrasted well with the dark tones of *wengé* wood used for floors and furnishings.

All furniture on board is lined with scented cedar wood, and the fabric used for the curtains, sofas and bed covers can be chosen by the buyer from two different lines: Sport or Charm.

Access to the salon is through a sliding, four-paneled crystal glass door that faces two sofas. The one to starboard, which is L-shaped and can be transformed into a spare queensized bed, has rounded seating facing forward, a rounded Ottoman to aft and a side table.


A second sofa is to port between a cupboard for tableware and steps leading down to the galley. The central table has a pivotable top and its height can be adjusted, allowing it to serve as both a dining table and coffee table. Should the owner choose the optional extra bed, the table may be lowered to facilitate the transformation from sofa to bed.

The helm station has been designed with the same materials and colors as the other Open models; iridescent gray and aluminum-colored instrument panels with a two-seat reclining sofa for comfort while navigating and a glass-top cabinet to one side.

Opaline inserts, positioned under the windshield, filter daylight through to the corridor leading to the sleeping area and the bathroom in the master suite.

This is a spectacular vessel. Although it is the "baby" of the range, is far, far more than an entry-level boat.







Endlessly painful academic blather

y editor asked that I read Verisimilitude because the novel is set in contemporary Phuket. Self-published by Australian university lecturer Harry Nicolaides, the 226-page book was printed in Thailand.

Like other paperbacks, the

first four pages contain paragraph-long quotes of extravagant praise for Verisimilitude - "an undisguised bold-faced assault on Thailand's presentation culture and its rank obsession with the appearance of truth"; "the archetypal Odyssean journey"; "asks the most important

question of our age" ... all of them written by the author himself! Sublime chutzpah.

The first two chapters are not so much badly written as badly overwritten, with swathes of deep-purple prose. Driving up

by jeep from Phuket, hero Savvas and girlfriend Prisana return to her lovely home village of Nongpajik in Chiang Rai. After teaching at "Prince of Mahidol University" in Phuket, they are to teach at Chiang Rai University.

You can almost forgive such purple prose for the sheer novelty that the girl-

friend is a university ajarn and not a bar girl. But after a twoday idyll in the village, Savvas slips out to his jeep, intent on abandoning Prisana.

Chapter 3 is a flashback to two years before. Savvas is teaching at a language school in Phuket. There is the obligatory morally-horrified description of Soi Bangla: "The sheer sun-worshiping hedonism that sweated through the voluptuous landscape of white sandy beaches and azure water during the day gave way in the evening to buttockslapping, beer-swilling debauchery and buccaneer carousing in the hundreds of go-go bars and beer bars that infested Patong."

But his true moralistic norror he reserves for that scum of the earth – teachers of English. They reek of malignant neuroses, private obsessions and sordid sexual fetishes. "His pot-marked [sic], wrinkled skin sagged with sin. His large forlorn eyes were cesspools," is how one teaching colleague is described.

Furthermore, it's all a CIA plot – with operatives planted in the Thai educational system to promote "acquiescence and rapacious consumerism. This appetite for Western products had developed into a cargo cult of consumption with only the vested interests of American businesses being served at the expense of cultural diversity and heritage."

And on and on and on. Verisimilitude is 226 pages of loony left rhetoric, punctuated by insipid dialog, cardboard characters and a gimerack plot. This is not a novel but a rant, peppered with

howling typos and dumb errors. For example, the resort beaches of Phuket are on the west coast, not the east, and Krabi is east of Phuket, not north-


And this is the gimcrack plot: Ajarn Prisana falls in love with Italian teacher Georgio Fandango

(yes, really).

"She curled her tongue into his mouth and licked his ears like a serpent. Georgio sighed in ecstasy, his body convulsing and buckling with powerful spasms. Engulfed by passion, their bodies

bonded together in a ferocious rhapsody of lust." The author really should stick to politics.


American teacher Kane Lambin doesn't like Savvas, and one day washes up drowned on Kata Beach. Murder or suicide? Four FBI agents (!) turn up to investigate. Their



This is followed by another 21-page catechism in which Savvas expounds on love as he and Prisana, now lovers, drive up from Phuket. A stop in Bangkok allows this observation: "Under the golden arches of McDonald's a delinquent generation was exposed to a combination of rapacious consumerism, corporate corpulence and the cultural imperialism of the West."

And so on and so forth. You get the idea. This is – and I say this in genuine awe – the worst novel I have ever read.

Best advice is being ignored

Now that the country is in the midst of a political stalemate that has hamstrung the democratic process and divided the electorate along class lines, it is a good time to reflect upon the words of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej's speech of December 4, 1997, to mark his 70th birthday.

During that address, His Majesty urged his subjects to adopt a "self-sufficiency" economy, based on the Buddhist principles of self-reliance and on taking the middle path. Being honest, finding satisfaction through moderation and freeing ourselves from the clutches of greed were the keys to happiness, we were told. But we did not listen

About six months after that speech was made, the Phuket Solid Waste Incineration Plant went into operation at Saphan Hin. Since then, the amount of garbage sent to the plant from the island's 21 local government administration bodies has increased by 7% a year, on average [see *First Person*, page 25].

Some 430 tons of garbage are now being sent there every day, even though the incinerator is capable of burning only 250 tons of it. What better indication could there possibly be of our collective failure to heed HM The King's sage advice than this enormous increase in the amount of refuse we produce?

A 12-rai landfill near the incineration plant, initially intended to serve as a refuse pit for incinerator ash, is now being used to bury the garbage the incinerator cannot handle – about 180 tons of it daily. The man in charge of it admits that the site will be filled by year's end

Phuket desperately needs a second incineration unit at the plant in order to prevent the entire island from becoming one giant garbage dump, an extension of the wasteland one can now see behind the water treatment plant in Patong (see page 6), along Soi Panieng north of Phuket City and at numerous other locations islandwide.

But unfortunately, thanks to the current political situation, no one knows when funding for the 1-billion-baht incinerator upgrade project will be approved.

In the meantime, many people are now appealing to HM The King to intervene in the current political standoff. Others are rushing out to buy one of the 56,000 "Long Live The King" bracelets now available on the island to mark the 60th anniversary of his accession to the throne. Many are doing both.

One has to wonder, however, how many of these people are also taking the time to reflect on his advice and to find a way to put it into practice in their own lives.

The Kennel Club of Thailand (KCT) is extremely active and hosts Asian Kennel Union Shows at least twice a year.

Moreover, the Federation Cynologique Internationale – the largest canine organization in the world – hosts international shows with international titles awarded to the winners. Besides this, there are general championship shows.

There is a dog show of some form or other held most weekends in Bangkok, run under the auspices of the KCT. These are well-attended affairs.

At the international fourday shows dogs and their breeders attend from many countries in the region such as Malaysia, Indonesia, the Philippines, South Korea, Taiwan and Japan, and quality is high in a lot of the breeds.

Judges are invited from around the world and the organization of these events is on par with anything in the West.

Solid reasons behind Phuket's waste problem

olid waste disposal poses a serious problem for Phuket because the amount of trash continues to grow annually.

Knowing that the budget approval process for a new incinerator was likely to be slow, the city began a garbage separation campaign at the beginning of 2006. By doing this, we hope to reduce the amount of waste that needs to be put in the landfill until the second unit, also to be rated at 250 tons per day, goes into ser-

The amount of solid waste collected in Phuket has been increasing about 7% annually. It increased to 430 tons per day in 2006, up from 248 tons daily in 2000.

The Phuket Solid Waste Incineration Plant in Phuket City is responsible for burning or burying all waste delivered to it from the island's 21 local administrations. As we weigh each delivery, we know that Phuket City Municipality contributes the most with an average of 38,600 tons a year)approximately 106 tons a day). After this comes Patong Municipality at 21,000 tons a year (57 tons a day), and Tambon Rassada with 10,600 tons yearly (29 tons a day), on average.

In addition to 21 municipalities, there are other sources of waste. These include the private sector and trash brought to Phuket from off-island. All of the waste from the Phi Phi Islands is brought to Phuket by barge, for example. Another source is from yachts that visit and offload their garbage here. We can expect the contribution from this sector to continue growing as well.

At the plant, we have to separate out the 250 tons that is to be burned. The rest we have



We need a second incineration unit if we want to incinerate all of the waste produced here, but the billion-baht budget for this still has not been approved. Even when it is approved, it will still take about 18 months to build the fa-

In the meantime, we really need a shift in people's attitudes with regard to waste disposal. If people are given an economic incentive, they will sort, recycle and re-use their household waste. We already see this with the people who go around and pick out bottles and other salable items from people's roadside trash before the municipal trash trucks

A big problem is that up to 65% of the garbage collected in Phuket today is waste food [and other organic wastes]. We have to find economic incentives in order to reduce this organic waste component. This is particularly challenging in a province such as Phuket, because for a long time provincial development has favored tourism over more traditional industries, like raising pigs and chickens, that can put much of this waste food to good use. If Phuket were still an agricultural province, we could compost the organic waste and sell it to farms.

We want to build a more advanced waste separation and biogas plant next year, as this will help produce compost and create methane gas, which can be used to help power the incinerator. [see Inside Story, Gazette issue of March 25, 2006].

We have also had the idea to begin the sorting of refuse at each house, with three different trash trucks to collect waste of various types: the first for garbage and other organic waste; the second for dry waste to be incinerated; the third for toxic and other hazardous wastes. We already have the vehicles we need, and this will start as a pilot project in the city in mid-2007, expanding into other areas after that.

We will need cooperation from local administrations to accomplish this, however. If we get it, we could greatly reduce the amount of waste that needs to be incinerated or put into the land-

fill. Unfortunately, on many of the occasions when we hold meetings on waste disposal issues, they are only attended by lowranking officials from the tambons and tessabans [municipalities] who lack decision-making authority. Many high-ranking officials seem not to care, since the incinerator is in Phuket City, not their own jurisdiction.

It is because of this lack of cooperation that garbage separation schemes are never successful in Phuket – or in the rest of Thailand for that matter. There are no laws forcing communities to sort their garbage, and community leaders are either unable or unwilling to make it happen.

In fact, Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura earlier this year announced an island-wide garbage separation campaign, asking the local administrations to encourage homeowners to sort their garbage into three groups: recyclable materials such as glass bottles; biodegradable wastes such as wood, leaves and durian husks; and hazardous wastes. But even though Phuket is a small province, wherein such a program should be easy to implement, there was no action by local administrations.

Even if we do get the budget for a second incineration unit, I still think Phuket faces and enormous waste disposal problems in the future because the amount of garbage will continue to increase while at the same time the island is running out of landfill space.

We have about 20,000 people visiting the incineration plant each year. We hope this will help people to become more aware of the waste disposal problem and encourage them to take part in efforts that will reduce the amount of garbage.





There is a very interesting fable about Ang Pao Day. Many years ago, a strange wild animal came to the village to eat a child year after year. The parents would hold a raffle and the unlucky loser would sacrifice his or her child to this beast.

One day an old man came to the village and pointed out that the animal came only on one particular day each year.

He advised them to wear red, light firecrackers and beat pots and pans together on that dreadful day. This, he said, would scare the beast away.

It worked, and the villagers,

having thus saved their children, were happy and gave yah soi chien, or red envelopes, to their children so that they would be

Since then, it has become tradition for Chinese people to practice this activity yearly.

Yah means "fold" and soi means "one year". The word chien means "money". Later, the shorter expression "red envelope" or ang pao replaced the use of yah soi chien. The adults would present red envelopes at midnight or noon on the last day of the year or they could also be given on New Year's Day.

Everyone looks forward to this special day. The family come together and pay respect to the gods and to their ancestors.

The older people such as the father, mother, grandparents, aunts and uncles give each of their nieces, nephews, grandchildren and their children an ang pao. The older children present their parents with ang

In a Chinese company, the owner will give ang pao to employees as a bonus. The amount depends on how successful the business was in the past year.

The view from Windows Vista

Windows XP is getting long in the tooth. When XP first hit the stands in October, 2001, it set new standards for reliability, usefulness, fun ... and orneriness and inscrutability.

Four and a half years later, XP's manifest shortcomings have turned our lives around. Don't believe it? Think about how many times you heard the terms "virus", "worm", "phishing" and "spoofing" five years ago.

I have spent most of the past two months working with

progressively more interesting beta test copies of the next version of Windows

 formerly codenamed "Longhorn" and now branded "Vista".

I don't get excited about new Microsoft software very often. I'm excited about Vista. I rant and rave and swear at it, to be sure. But Windows Vista has all the hallmarks of a worthy successor to Windows XP – high praise indeed – if Microsoft can get the bugs ironed out in the next six months or so.

Windows Vista will appear in eight – count 'em, eight – different versions. Microsoft hasn't yet nailed down all of the features, but the way things stand, most of the people I know will be interested in only three of the versions.

Vista Home Premium will rapidly become the most common choice for home- and small-business users. It includes features that are currently in Windows

ny way you look at it, Media Center (for controlling audio and video throughout the house, including HDTV, recording broadcast TV shows, burning DVDs, working with a TVlike remote control, and so on); the new Aero Glass interface (about which more shortly); simplified backup and lots of new security features.

Vista Business apparently won't include Windows Media Center, but it will have Remote Desktop (so you can dial in to your computer while you're away from your desk); various meeting capabilities and full support for

> attaching to a client/server "domain".

> Vista Ultimate contains all

of the features in all of the versions – and I'll bet it's going to have a price tag to match.

The other five versions sport congenital flaws that probably won't appeal to most users. Windows Vista Starter Edition, like the current XP Starter Edition, consists of a massively stunted copy of Windows aimed at specific Third World countries. I think of it as an insult, and a placeholder – most folks who buy a new computer with Starter Edition will immediately install a bootleg copy of the real Windows over the top.

Vista Home "N" and Vista Business "N" serve as grotesque window dressing, dropping Windows Media Center Edition to placate European Union regulators. I bet they'll sell 10 copies each.

Vista Home Basic rates as

basic, indeed. No Media Center. No DVD burning. No network backup. And a stripped-down user interface that looks just like XP. I think of Home Basic as "Vista Home Bait and Switch". Why? Microsoft obligingly ships all of Vista Home Premium on the Home Basic CD.

If you decide to upgrade, you need only fork over your cash in exchange for a key that "unlocks" the features everyone should have anyway.

Leave it to Microsoft to find a novel way to keep milking that cash cow.

The eighth version, Vista Enterprise, contains all of the features in Vista Business, plus a handful of goodies that make it easier to administer and protect a Vista Enterprise PC on a large client/server network. As far as I can tell today, you will be able to buy Vista Enterprise only through Microsoft's volume licensing plan, called Software

What's to like about Vista? Plenty. If you bought the right version (which is to say, any except the Starter Edition or Vista Bait and Switch), and you own a fairly hefty video card, the moment you start Vista you'll see the new Aero Glass interface, and it'll take your breath away.

The see-through effects around the edges of windows on the screen, combined with a truly useful stripe on the right side of the screen called the Sidebar, make Windows work much bet-

I know Aero Glass looks like

simple eye candy. I know that Mac OS/X has something that acts much like the Sidebar. (In fact, both Apple and Microsoft "borrowed" the Sidebar idea from a company called Konfabu-

But if you play with the new interface for more than a few minutes, I guarantee you'll come away impressed.

Behind the fancy interface is a vastly improved core, with security a foremost concern. In the current beta test version, Vista 5308, security settings are so tight they make you click and click and click again, simply to perform mundane tasks.

I fully expect Microsoft to back off most of the ridiculous restrictions in place now, but I know that Vista will take a lot more work than XP, simply to keep the creepy-crawlies out of your machine.


In the coming months, as Vista's features shake out, I'll keep you posted on its progress. The important point to know right now is this: Microsoft will release the next version of Windows (and the next version of Office) in ear-


As we get closer, you'll hear no end of hype, propelled by Microsoft's US\$500-million (20billion-baht) advertising push. Most of what you'll hear will amount to little more than marketing drivel. But if Microsoft stabilizes Vista in time, without cutting too many features, it's going to be a magnificent product.

The Bank of Japan, Japan's central bank, has now arrived at a compromise – it is gradually ending its ultra-loose monetary policy in a process known as "quantitative easing" by tightening liquidity in the system. This process is expected to take about three months, but, in reality, will depend on economic data.

It is difficult to compare directly inflation rates in Japan with those of most other major economies. This is because of the way Tokyo measures inflation or deflation. Normally, when central bankers or economists refer to inflation, it comes in two variet-

ies – "headlines" and "core". The latter excludes the effects of energy and food prices, both of which tend to be volatile and can cause distortion.

The Japanese, however, include energy prices as part of their "core" inflation/deflation statistics, and this makes their real situation more obscure.

The US, meanwhile, has been recording some very moderate economic data, prompting US Treasury Secretary John Snow to comment that the US economy has hit a "sweet spot".

Looked at from a domestic US perspective, this makes sense. Core inflation is running at around 2%, and economic growth at around 3%.

The "flash" estimate of Gross Domestic Product for the first quarter of 2006 may well reflect a higher annualized figure, but when account is taken of the lower-than-anticipated 1.7% revised figure for the last quarter

US in a 'sweet spot' – but currency a worry

of 2005, the overall situation may well be relatively balanced.

BUSINESS &

There is, unfortunately, more than a totally domestic economic perspective that needs to be considered by the international investor, or even by US investors looking at the broader picture.

Assuming that the "sweet spot" continues, the US is ap-

proaching the end of its interest-rate-tightening cycle. Perhaps the US central bank, the Federal Reserve, or "Fed", will stop raising interest rates at around 5%, or maybe a little higher.

Currency markets are concerned that the focus is switching from the US tight-

ening cycle to another area – the US current account deficit. This was an enormous US\$225 billion (9 trillion baht) in the last quarter of 2005. The only way to fill that "hole" is with foreign money, but economic data so far in 2006 show that foreign investment in the US is not keeping pace. This is worrying.

The European Central Bank is raising short-term interest rates, and has clearly indicated that it intends to continue doing

In Japan, tightening domestic liquidity – assuming that the economic recovery remains intact – is a precursor to raising interest rates. This will probably

not occur until late 2006 or even early in 2007, but already long-term interest rates have moved upward.

It is now more attractive for Japanese investors to move their money back home. Allied to this situation is the fact that the Yen has been used extensively by hedge funds and other market participants as a "funding" currency. In other words, huge sums of money have been borrowed in Yen to invest in other higher-yielding markets, principally emerging markets.

But if interest rates are to move higher, investors will have to start reversing their positions. This is not the sort of party where it is best to be the last to leave, as the devil will take the hindmost.

With higher rates becoming apparent, who is going to invest in the US in sufficient volume to

keep the dollar stable? It is becoming increasingly apparent that there is likely to be a shortfall, and this means that – in pure economic terms – the US dollar will fall.

Even Warren Buffet, the Sage of Omaha, has recently predicted a gradual decline in the value of the dollar. Last year he took positions against the dollar, betting that it would fall, but his timing was wrong and he lost some US\$800 million. Despite this he is now again predicting a slide.

However, economics and reality often differ. Economists live in a world of frictionless markets, and markets frequently ignore situations – but when they do react, the reaction can be very abrupt. Bulls and Bears exist not only in stock markets only, but in every market. When perceptions change, markets have a tendency to overreact.

In an ideal world, the US dollar would probably have fallen in value already, and the current account problem would have at last been partly corrected as imports become more expensive and exports cheaper and more attractive.


But it is not as simple as that. Countries such as India and China are maintaining what is politely termed a "managed float" against the US Dollar. The other term – which is not so politically correct – is a "dirty float". In other words, these countries are holding down the value of their currencies against the dollar artificially, in order to benefit from competitively-priced exports to the US.

One only has to look at the vast foreign exchange reserves, especially in Asia, to see what is happening. However, the Japanese are not managing their currency against the US dollar at present levels, as their investors have moved enough money out of Japan.

Combined with the use of the Yen as a funding currency, this has naturally kept the Yen "weak" for about two years.

The situation appears to be changing, and the Euro is likely to benefit – although European politicians will begin to panic once the Euro approaches US\$1.30. The US Dollar may well be under pressure in 2006, but unless the Fed increases interest rates too much there may be reasonable gains this year in US stock markets.

Non-project displays will be grouped according to their pri-


mary business in the property industry, such as offering legal advice, developers, construction and finishings, he said.

Meyer has been BCIS's rock in the batting department and his runs – although not what one would call prolific – proved decisive in a low-scoring game.



am not a great fan of social climbers. You know the type – they're desperate to be seen with the right people in all the right places, so they can move up in the world – or at least in their own estimation.

The larger the city, the more this kind of nonsense takes place. In a metropolis such as London or New York, they're everywhere.

Every art gallery is packed to the gills with pretentious types doing their best to be creative in front of each other. I'm convinced that most of them haven't a clue what the so-called "art" in the middle of the floor is actually supposed to be.

ANGST

They can, of course, never admit to such a social *faux pas*, and have long-winded conversations with similarly pretentious types about the artist "capturing the true essence of the angst of inner-city youth, while enhancing the juxtaposition of modern architecture against the stereotypical environment of the working classes".

Surely they must realize what they're staring at is just a pile of bricks?

Luckily, here in Phuket, this kind of pillock (the word speaks for itself, even if you have never heard it before) is not too prevalent. Inevitably there's an exception to every rule, and there are those who like to join the right business association so they can "network".

All I can do is quote that wise old Yorkshire expression, "The higher a monkey climbs, the more it shows its ar**."

One of the more famous climbers of the plant world is also fairly social, but doesn't exhibit this by joining local business associations. The philodendron, or

mai luay in Thai, does so in a more laid-back manner.

It doesn't even bother to grow a supporting structure for itself; since it has better things to do. The name philodendron derives from the Greek *philos* for loving and *dendron*, a tree.

Indolent (I've been looking for an excuse to use that word) doesn't begin to describe this plant—it relies solely on stronger and more self-reliant plants

It attaches itself to the host and wraps around it. It doesn't do any harm in the process – it may be bone idle, but it doesn't display any malice. Why would it want to harm the plant that's doing all the hard work for it?

There is a huge variety of philodendrons, in all shapes and colors. If you get one for yourself, train it to grow up a moss-covered stick so that the roots can sink into the moss. If you buy one from a garden center, the pot may already have a moss-covered stick in the middle anyway – someone has already set the plant off in the right direction.

The support system doesn't even have to be something natural in order to act as host to this

selfish climber – the plant will use it, man-made or otherwise. If you have a concrete pole supporting a carport or balcony roof, then this is the perfect way to try to hide it – the philodendron will quickly become the pole's best friend as it claws its way upwards.

These pole plants must be continuously pruned to keep the vines on the pole, as they can frequently go astray. You'll probably prefer something that's fairly "leafy" looking, so you'll need to trim back new growth on the vine tips. This keeps the plant full, helps to prevent it from looking stringy, and curbs its natural tendency toward dreadlocks.

This group of plants ranges from vines with heart-shaped 10centimeter-long green leaves to vines with leaves up to a meter in length. Some types have glossy, solid green leaves, others have velvet-textured, patterned leaves, while yet others have deep-red leaves and stems.

Most of the philodendrons in Thailand are of the larger varieties, although there are a few that are quite small. These are the ones you see clambering up a metal chain from a pot, wrapping themselves around the links which would appear to be the perfect way to encourage them.

These little things grow like crazy – even indoors. Their progress will be curbed only if the pot they're climbing from runs out of water.


Water is just about all the philodendron needs. Water it often enough to keep the soil evenly moist, but don't let it get claggy, or let the plants stand in water. Phuket's high humidity is ideal for enthusiastic growth, but philodendrons will also tolerate a low level of humidity if you want to grow them inside your air-conditioned mansion.


SUNBURN

Most philodendrons are native to the jungles of tropical America, and are more content with the medium light intensity they would have on the jungle floor. They do get unhappy if given a sunny spot in the garden, as the leaves start to develop sunburn. Most philodendrons prefer indirect or curtain-filtered sunlight.

The philodendron may be one of the champion climbers of the plant world, but it will never be caught whispering nonsense about a pile of bricks. Take one out for a day in the Phuket sun, and the plant will make it quite clear that it should be where we all should be – quietly enjoying a beer in the ample shade of a conveniently placed tree.

Prices hover around 28-30,000 baht and you can even submit your own design for consideration.



Project aims at high end

LAYAN: Work got underway in January on the Phutawan Residence & Spa, a luxury villa complex on a 60-rai hillside overlooking Layan Beach.

Developer SuriyaJan Properties Co is investing 17 million baht in the construction of each of the project's six units, all to be located under the government's 80-meter limit on permanent hillside structures.

Total investment in the project has not been disclosed, but the homes will sell at prices starting from 45 million baht.
