Dive industry rules revealed

PHUKET: Provincial authorities have distributed to dive operators in Phuket a draft of the new regulations governing the licensing of dive businesses.

At a meeting on July 26, Phuket Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura gave the parties concerned a week to reply with comments or suggestions about the regulations.

The draft regulations, in Thai language, are divided into three parts. The final version of the regulations will come into effect in about one month and businesses will then have a further 60 days to comply with the regulations.

One part covers environmental concerns and protection of coral, and applies to boat race organizers as well as dive businesses. {Editorial: page 26}

The second part gives instructions on how to register as a dive operator, while the final part sets out plans for the formation of three committees.

The first committee will receive applications for permission to operate a diving business or organize boat races; the second will examine applications before presentation to the governor and the third will inspect licensed businesses and deal with illegal operators.

The draft covering registration dictates that dive operators must register their business with the Phuket Marine Office and must present the company's registration documents and tax information, the work permits of foreign staff, all boat registration documents including the names of captain and crew, records of

salaries and wages, and details of any related website, the company payment system, diving courses and students.

The dive businesses that are granted permission to operate from the province will also have to submit monthly reports giving details of income, current staff and dive trips. Businesses that fail

to submit reports or that are deemed to have submitted inadequate reports will risk having their permission to operate withdrawn.

The moves were announced on July 26 at a meeting chaired by Governor Udomsak at Phuket Provincial Hall. Rep-Continued on page 2

Jetstar sets out fares and schedules for Phuket flights

PHUKET: Australian budget airline Jetstar has unveiled its fares and flight schedules for long-haul international operations that will include a service between Sydney and Phuket starting in November this year.

Subject to regulatory approval, the airline, a subsidiary of Australian flag carrier Qantas, will launch its Thai operations on November 23 with a direct Melbourne-Bangkok service.

The following day, Jetstar will launch its first scheduled Sydney-Phuket service. Both services will initially be three times a week, using Airbus A330-200 aircraft with 303 seats in two classes — economy and StarClass, Jetstar's premium cabin.

Jetstar General Manager of Pricing and Offline Channels, David Koczkar, speaking in Bangkok, said, "We lead the low fare market in Australia, a positioning we hope to now lead with our flights to Thailand, encouraging more people to travel more often.

"Bangkok and Phuket are two of the most popular tourism destinations in Asia for Australians, and with Jetstar's high brand recognition in Australia and a genuine national appetite for low fares, we believe we will encourage thousands of regular and new tourists to [fly to] these destinations."

The economy fares are strictly no-frills; Jetstar passengers who want to eat en-route will be able to buy meals and snacks either when they buy a ticket or on board. They will also have to pay for pillows, blankets and inflight entertainment.

resentatives from the diving and tourism industries, local government and tourism authorities also attended.

The Governor explained to the assembly that the draft regulations were not designed to make people's lives more complicated, but were to be put in place to protect the environment and to ensure operators were acting within

He also said that any ideas raised in the meeting could be incorporated into the regulations before they came into effect.

Measures suggested in the meeting, but not yet included in the new regulations, included setting safety and insurance standards and encouraging the training of Thais as dive mas-

After the meeting the Governor told reporters, "We are trying to establish a system that will be acceptable to all, and help to

ensure tourism in the long term by protecting the environment for future generations.

"We will wait for comments from everyone concerned before enacting the regulations so that we do not have to change them later. I believe that other provinces will follow our lead.'

Palad Nivit said that no dive operators had opposed the registration process.

Some, however, had stated their concern about the possibility of rules mandating the training of Thais as dive masters or

They pointed out that this was an expensive process and, in their experience, the Thais, after training, would often quit to seek work elsewhere in the in-

Gov Udomsak was abroad at the time of going to press. He was expected to bring the new rules into force soon after his return on August 3.

www.jetstar.com, through which flights may be booked and paid for, shows both the Sydney-Phuket and Melbourne-Bangkok fares set at A\$199 (about 4,400 baht), subject to

The Jetstar service to Phuket will leave Sydney on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at

The return flights will take off from Phuket on the same days at 10:20 pm.

The service from Melbourne to Bangkok will take off on Mondays, Thursdays and Sundays at 2:10 pm, with the return flights taking off on the same days at 9 pm.

• Meanwhile, Malaysia Airlines has resumed its pre-tsunami schedule between Phuket and Kuala Lumpur, reverting to two flights a day.

Starting August 1, flights have been taking off from Kuala Lumpur at 9:30 am and 6:10 pm every day, with return flights at 10:25 am and 7:20 pm.

An introductory fare of 2,222 baht return is being offered for flights taken before or on August 14. Bookings must be made by August 11.

Up until September 15, the airline is also offering return flights for 2,599 baht if booked at least 14 days in advance, or 3,099 baht if booked at least three days in advance.

Teens targeted in HIV awareness drive


PHUKET: The growing number of young adults testing positive for HIV/Aids in the province has prompted the launch of an awareness drive aimed at teenagers and those in their early 20s.

At Phuket Provincial Hall on July 25, former Senator for Khon Kaen and women's rights activist Rabiabrat Pongpanich, currently President of the Society for Promoting Happy Families, chaired a meeting of the heads of the three Chalermprakiet Centers in Phuket.

Based at major government hospitals throughout the country, the centers provide support for HIV/Aids patients.

During the meeting, private organizations pledged 420,000 baht to the centers to help launch the campaign.

K. Rabiabrat said, "I worry more about teenagers contracting HIV than adults, because teenagers are less likely to practice safe sex... Teenagers often want to engage in premarital sex and they tend to trust their partners more than their parents. For this reason, parents need to talk

to their children more about relationships and teach them about life, because teenagers are easily influenced – especially the girls.

"Most teenagers have unprotected sex and do not know enough about sexual relationships. They do not know the true meaning of love and often lack the ability to differentiate between love and sex. They should love themselves, their parents, their self-respect and their families first," she explained.

Tsunami worry sparks deep seabed survey

CAPE PANWA: The Jakrathong Tongyai, a 38-meter Department of Fisheries research vessel operating out of the Phuket Marine Biological Center, will be fitted out with cutting-edge German technology to map sections

of the continental shelf edge in the Andaman Sea, some 300 kilometers from shore.

The purpose of the mapping is to determine whether or not the steeply-sloping shelf edge, which has never been mapped, is stable.

There is concern that, if the shelf edge is not stable, another big earthquake in the region could trigger a submarine landslide, causing a tsunami.

The research, to be carried out during three separate voyages at the end of this year and the beginning of next, is part of a joint effort between Thai researchers from the Southeast Asia START Regional Center, based at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok and led by Dr Anond Snidvongs, and a team of German experts led by Dr Willi Weinrebe of the IFM Geomar Research Institute

analyzed in an effort to find evidence of past submarine slumps or landslides in the area.

If found, such evidence might indicate that Thailand's Andaman coastline is vulnerable not only to tsunamis generated by sudden tectonic uplift events displacing large volumes of water - such as was the case with the December 26, 2004, tsunami – but also to a "secondary" class of tsunamis that originate when there is little or no water displacement, as is the case with an underwater slide.

"Even though there is no water displacement, the sheer volume of such a submarine landslide, which can be in the order of thousands of cubic kilometers of material, can also create a tsunami," explained Dr Anond.

Both he and Dr Weinrebe cited the case of the tsunami waves, up to 15 meters in height, that killed thousands of people along the northern coast of Papua New Guinea in 1998.

They said that most scien-Information gathered will be tists agree that the waves were produced by an underwater slide, and not by any uplift associated with the 7.0-Richter-magnitude earthquake that is thought to have triggered the slide.

Phuket tourism leaders tour Suvarnabhumi

PHUKET, BANGKOK: Following the inaugural flight from Phuket International Airport to Thailand's new Suvarnabhumi Airport on July 29, key representatives of Phuket tourism businesses and the Provincial Government called on the central government to expand the country's major domestic airports.

With some 20 VIPs and members of the media from Phuket on board, Thai Airways International (THAI) flight TG 1882 landed at Suvarnabhumi at 12:59 pm.

After disembarking, the group was given a three-hour tour of the 155-billion-baht airport, which is scheduled to open for regular flights on September 28.

Phuket Vice-Governor Niran Kanlayanamit said, "This is good for tourism, especially when we promote on our road shows that Thailand has an airport with the latest technology, and Suvarnabhumi is big enough to support the airlines that plan to come here."

Pattanapong Aikvanich, former President of the Phuket Tourism Association and still an adviser to the organization, was clearly impressed.

"I'm very happy that Thailand has a very big – and very beautiful – airport. It can serve up to 45 million passengers a year and within the next two years it will be expanded to cater to double that number."

However, he added, "I think the central government should improve the other airports in Thailand, too, because flights should connect and not just create air traffic to [Bangkok]. Main cities in each region should have a big airport such as this."

As an aside, K. Pattanapong noted, "It's a pity that the Sky Train will not be picking up passengers from the airport for the next two years. That service should start when the airport opens in September."

Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwannasupana was proud of the image Suvarnabhumi airport gives tourists arriving in Thailand. "I've been to many countries and I think this is the only airport that has a clear identity. The decoration truly shows Thailand's culture," she said.

Gov unhappy at deal for airport meter taxi desk

PHUKET: Phuket Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura has expressed displeasure with new arrangements announced by the Airports Organization of Thailand (AOT), granting exclusive rights to organize meter taxis at the airport to a firm that owns no cars.

At a meeting held on July 26, the AOT announced that it had awarded a concession to open a meter-taxi counter in the airport to the Phuket Taxi Meter Co (PTMC).

The governor expressed his surprise, however, that PTMC does not operate any cars of its own and will act merely as an agent for other companies, at a charge of 40 baht per trip.

PTMC will pay the AOT around 30,000 baht a month for the privilege of running the counter. In return, all meter taxis wanting to pick up passengers at the airport will have to use PTMC's services.

The no-taxi "taxi" company stands to make good money; the airport is, it seems, about to get a lot more taxis. This is because of another decision by the AOT to enforce the definition of "limousines" as cars with engine capacities of two liters or more.

The limousine operators' organization, Phuket Limousine and Business Service Cooperative (PBC), in order to extend its concession to run services at the airport, was forced to agree to this stipulation. In return, the concession fee was halved.

According to the deal, all cars with engines smaller than 2,000cc will have to downgrade to become meter taxis or cease operating at the airport.

Manod Choosak, the PBC President, said that the PBC has about 65 "limousines" with engines smaller than 2,000cc. He said he did not know how many of these would become meter taxis. Only 30 of the PBC's members' saloons have engines that comply with the two-liter rule.

Charn Jaimjaroen, Assistant Director of Phuket International Airport, said, "Under the terms of the contact we cannot allow any companies to operate meter taxis at the airport without going through PTMC. If the PBC wants to have meter taxis then it will have to pay PTMC."

In other words, PBC members who decide to take the meter-taxi route, yet remain PBC members, will pay twice – once as their share of the PBC concession and again through PTMC at a rate of 40 baht a trip.

K. Charn said that the AOT signed a contract with PTMC last year, authorizing it to organize the meter taxi services at the airport. He added that the AOT is "following provincial policy on offering more transport options for customers".

Gov Udomsak, however, was not impressed. He said, "The AOT have assured me that they cannot cancel the contract with PTMC now, even though the company does not have cars itself.

"Therefore I will allow the AAT to give PTMC a three-month trial period to see how the service works. If PTMC deviates from any points in the contract then [the contract] will have to be canceled," he said.

The Governor added that he had envisaged the meter taxi desk being run by a collective of meter taxi drivers. He wanted the drivers to be able to make a living without having to pay fees to third parties, he explained.

PTMC was last in the news in 2003 when it still had taxis and announced that it was increasing its fare to the airport from elsewhere in Phuket to 250 baht because the limousine concession barred non-limousine operators collecting passengers from the airport.

At the time of going to press, the company's principal, Patipol Prakobtan, was not available for comment.

American fugitive arrested

PHUKET (*Gazette*, *Nation*): An alleged pedophile wanted in the United States was arrested in Phuket on July 28 after laying low in Thailand for five years.

Police and apprehended fugitive Charles Todd Stokes, 45, in a hotel room in Cherng Talay, Phuket Tourist Police Inspector Pol Maj Bundit Khaosutham said.

Stokes, who used to work as a teacher in Florida, had been

charged with molesting children before he escaped to Thailand five years ago. According to police he later opened an Englishlanguage school in Bangkok.

The arrest followed a raid by officers on an apartment stokes maintained in Pattaya. There they allegedly found around 100 photographs of boys aged nine to 11, both in school uniform and naked.





p until the attack that changed her life for ever, K. Tassaya lived with her maternal grandmother in Patong. Her job as a waitress at the Seagull Home Hotel in Patong helped support her parents, both rubber tappers living on Soi Yodsane in Chalong, where she grew up with them and her two older brothers, now 23 and 26.

Before the attack, K Tassava's three-year-old daughter Napasorn "Ice" Iat-talod was taken by her father to live in Nakhon Sri Thammarat, where the child was being raised by her paternal grandmother. K. Boonwiwat, an employee of HomePro in Phuket, returned to Phuket to work, but after the attack fled to his home province, where Kathu Police say he remains at large.

K. Tassaya's case became national news after she contacted the Paveena Hongsakul Foundation for Women and Children in Bangkok, and photos of her injuries were shown in national Thailanguage daily newspaper Kom Chad Leuk.

She told K. Paveena that the abuse started three years ago, when Boonwiwat nearly strangled her to death with the electrical cord of an iron and forced her to beg for her life. She finally left him after he followed her to work in a jealous rage one day and sliced her ear with a knife, she

"On April 6 this year he came to try and make up, but I refused and asked to end the relationship. When I turned to walk away, he splashed acid on my head, face and body. My aunt then rushed me to Vachira Phuket Hospital," she said.

The caustic acid was the kind commonly used in the processing of liquid latex into rubber mats.

Now, some four months after the assault, she is staying with relatives in Nakhon Pathom Province and undergoing a series of skin grafts at Yanhee Hospital in Bangkok. The third procedure is scheduled for August 19.

Foundation is paying all of the medical costs.

Remarkably, despite the abuse she has endured at the hands of K. Boonwiwat, she told the Gazette in a telephone interview that she had already forgiven him.

'Now I am 20 years old. I fell in love for the first time in my life four years ago. Maybe it was the last love of my life too, because I am not sure if anyone will want to love a girl who looks the way I do now," she said.

Fortunately, since the attack K. Tassaya has received a tremendous outpouring of support from friends and family.

Saying that she thought other women might learn a lesson from what happened to her, she said, "After I fell in love with him four years ago, it made me feel good when he got very jealous. I felt like it showed that he loved me as much as I loved him. I never thought his jealousy would end up making me the way I am today," she said. "Now I know love can have a dark side, too."

"But I still don't understand why he did this to me. He started to abuse me when he thought I had a new lover, but in fact I never did. I have only ever had one lover – him. I thought that our having a child together was an expression of that love and a real commitment between us."

"Even though I loved him, I was afraid of him - but I never thought he would do something like this. But I don't want to talk or think about him any more, because it brings up so many bad feelings and memories," she said, sobbing.

"We loved each other most of the time we were together. I loved him and I know he loved me, too. So I am ready for him to come back and love me again, because I have already forgiven him for everything," she added

She said that the warmth and kindness of her aunt's family

in Nakhon Pathom has allowed her to slowly recover both physically and mentally, but that she still fears the reaction people will have to her scars when she goes out in public.

K. Tassaya admitted that after the attack such feelings had caused her to fall into such a deep depression that she had contemplated suicide as a way of ending them. It has only been with all the love and support of her parents and other family members that she has been able to get through it, she said.

"I love my daughter, but now she lives with her paternal grandmother in Nakhon Sri

Thammarat, so I haven't had a chance to see her since my husband did this to me," she said.

She still refers to K. Boon-wiwat as her husband, even though the couple were never legally married.

"Our families haven't really talked since this crime, except when his mother called mine offering us 50,000 baht if we would drop the charges against their son," she said.

K. Tassaya's mother had refused the offer, saying no amount of money could make up for the damage he had caused.

Knowing that she might never see her daughter again only adds to the misery she has had to endure.


She hopes to return to Phuket, but is not sure when that will happen as she first wants her appearance to improve. The skin grafts she needs involve removing skin from the back of her legs and transplanting it to parts of her head, back and neck.

"The doctor lets me go to recover at my aunt's home between procedures. That helps, not only because I would get bored staying in the hospital all the time, but also because everyone there understands me and I don't feel like I need to cover up my scars in front of them, as I do when I go out in public," she said.

In Nakhon Pathom, K. Tassaya continues to wait for word from the police about her spouse. She confided to the *Gazette* that she wants him to be arrested, if only so she could have the chance to sit down with him, look him in the eyes and ask "Why?"

In the long term, she wants to return to Phuket because it is her home and where all of her family and friends are, she said. "But I still can't come back yet. I don't want to go back to Phuket looking like this, so I have to wait until the appearance of my face and body improves first," she said.

When the *Gazette* contacted Kathu Police for an update into the investigation, an officer said K. Boonwiwat was known to have fled to Nakhon Sri Thammarat and police there had been notified.

walked up to the hotel he was a little disappointed to find that two of the women had somehow disappeared. But reasoning that a bird in the hotel room is still better than three around a lunch table, he went upstairs with the remaining beauty.

The sign at the right of the picture says "Garbage dumping forbidden. Offenders will be prosecuted. Site for new Tambon Administration Organization offices."

But, the reader added, "During a short period of time I noticed several different people stop and add their household garbage to the growing pile."




Special flower stamp to honor the Queen

A new five-baht stamp is to be issued on August 12 as part of celebrations to mark HM Queen Sirikit's sixth-cycle birthday.

The stamp, which is 31 millimeters square, depicts a flower called *Mahaprom Rachini*, which was named by Her Majesty. The flower grows on a new variety of a shrub from the same family as the custard apple, or *noi na* in Thai.

First day covers will be available from all post offices, priced at 12 baht. A million copies of the stamp are being printed.

bling debts. On July 23, Bunnak Pannak, 61, traveled to the border town of Aranya Pratet in Sa Kaeo Province, where she requested help from 2nd Lt Prathuan Kaset of the Thai Rangers.

She reported that on July 19 she received a call from her son, Thaweep Uchuphap, 21, a second-year law student at Ramkhamhaeng University, saying that he had been gambling in a casino in the Cambodian border town of Poipet.

He was 50,000 baht in debt to a loan shark who would not let him return to Thailand until the debt was settled, she said.

After transferring the 50,000 baht into the account of the loan shark, K. Bunnak continued, her son was still not released. Instead, the loan shark demanded a further 11,000 baht in interest and threatened to send K. Thaweep to be detained in Phnom Penh if the money was not forthcoming.

Scared that paying the 11,000 would still fail to secure her son's release she decided to go to the border herself.

After listening to her report, 2nd Lt Prathuan took K. Bunnak

to Pol Maj Phakphong Saiubol, an inspector at the Aranya Prathet immigration check point. After checking immigration records Maj Phakphong confirmed that K. Thaweep had left Thailand on July 6 and had not returned.

Mai Phakphong ordered officers from the checkpoint to go the Grand Diamond City Casino, where K. Thaweep was being held, to assess the situation.

gamble, saying that they could not assist Thai nationals if they got into trouble abroad and adding that, in the end, it is the gamblers' families that really suffer.



Hemarat Thongreut, 38, was shot twice in the head with a .38-caliber pistol as he was parking his motorcycle. His two assailants made their escape on a motorcycle.

Police said that they thought the gunmen probably knew their victim well and followed him until they had a chance to get a close-range shot.

As for the motive, police said they were investigating two possibilities: a personal dispute or a bank customer angry at K. Hemarat, whose job included seizing people's property in lieu of unpaid debts, and which could well have made enemies for him.

ith the seemingly unstoppable onslaught of modern values and culture, many people are worried about the loss of more traditional aspects of life.

That is why Supachock Nisapakulchai, 36, Director of the Junior Good Will Ambassadors in Phuket, is trying to preserve traditional Thai dance in the only way possible; by passing knowledge on to the next generation.

Although he is a native of Bangkok, K. Supachock has been teaching Thai dance in Phuket as part of the Junior Good Will Ambassadors program for the past four years.

"I have a lot of experience in Thai dance. My family shares my love of Thai traditional culture, particularly dance, and has always supported me in my efforts. I graduated in Thai dancing from the Fine Arts Institute. Now I encourage my daughters to learn Thai dancing as well. I'm very lucky that they have all taken to it and enjoy it," he added.

"My first daughter, Nattida, was chosen as a Junior Good Will Ambassador for Thailand and was presented with a trophy by HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn. She got the chance to show her Thai dance skills in many countries around the world.

"Later, my second daughter, Phanklreo, was also selected as a Junior Good Will Ambassador.

"My third daughter, Katawan, was at first not as keen on dancing as her older sisters. However, with our encouragement she came to love it as much as the rest of us. All three of my daughters have now been to display Thai dancing abroad as Junior Ambassadors in countries such as China, Mongolia, South Korea, Australia and Japan. They have benefited greatly from it," he added.

K. Supachock, however, wants to spread his knowledge

and success beyond his family, which is why he has put so much effort into the Thai dance classes in Phuket.

"Thai dance it not easy to learn; it takes concentration and

perseverance. It can be divided into four main categories: Northern, Isarn, Central and Southern, though within each category there are many different styles, so students never get bored.

"Here we emphasize Thai-Chinese and Southern dance styles to reflect the make-up of the population," he explained.

K. Supachock often invites experts from the Fine Arts Department to come and join with the program.

"We are proud that the Thai Culture Council recognized the work we do and chose us to to be part of the Junior Good Will Ambassadors program.

"I would like to see more places to learn Thai dance in Phuket. After all, it is one of the most recognizable symbols of our country. "We have about 20 children studying with us now. They do not study everyday, though we do increase the number of practice hours before shows.

"The students don't practice just dancing. They also have to learn how to act, and how to hold a smile throughout a show. This is important – the smile is another symbol of Thailand," he added.

The fee is a modest 1,500 baht for a 30-hour course. "At first we didn't charge anything but eventually our costs became too high.

"We have to pay for makeup, clothes and accessories for the shows as well as everyday expenses, such as fuel and water," he explained.

Thai dancing has benefits beyond the course, he believes, helping children concentrate on their school work, and to work as part of a team. It also makes them

smile more.

Praerawee "Prae" Songnam, 13, a pupil of K. Supachock, agrees. She has been dancing with the Junior Good Will Ambassadors in Phuket for six months and said, "I love acting and music. Studying here has also helped me to concentrate, before I started dancing my concentration span was very short.

"Thai dancing is very difficult but I still love it. The classes have improved my self confidence as well – before I would never have dared perform in public," she said enthusiastically.

The children are often invited to perform at events in Phuket, and select from a variety of themes to suit the occasion.

"Sometimes we perform at wedding parties – we can even do shows portraying the bride and groom when they were beginning to fall in love with each other. These really entertain the guests," K. Supachock said.

Criminal biker gang probed on Koh Samui

n July 18 a team of more than 100 officers from the Department of Special Investigations (DSI), the Tourist Police and the Drugs Prevention and Suppression Department arrested members of an alleged criminal organization known as the Bandidos, a motorcycle gang founded in the US in the 1960s with a history of violence and drug-dealing.

The DSI had been investigating the gang – which allegedly has a Bangkok chapter – for several months before receiving a tipoff that some members were hiding on Koh Samui, including one of the leaders, Kim Lingard Nielsen, 36, a Danish national.

Other suspected members included another Danish citizen, two Britons and several Thai nationals thought to be involved in illegal activities including money laundering and blackmail.

Police divided into teams and set out to arrest the gang. One team arrested and charged Peter Watkin-Jones, 40, at his house in Bophut, but the other teams searching for foreigners found that their suspects had already fled the island.

Two of them, Nielson and his associate Crispin Paton-Smith, were later arrested in Pattaya. It later transpired that Peter Buch Rosenberg, the fourth foreigner sought by police, had already left the country for a meeting in his native Denmark.

Of the three Thai suspects, only Pramual Somwongse, a surveyor at the Samui Land Office, was apprehended. Two other suspects, named as Samroeng Buanak, a well-known local property agent, and Pratheep Muangkaew, who runs an accounting firm on Koh Samui, escaped arrest.

However Pratheep, a prosecutor attached to the Labour Court in Bangkok, later turned himself in to the police. Buanak is believed to have escaped to Singapore before the raid.

Initial reports suggested that the gang members had formed partnerships with local criminals in order to invest 3 billion baht in overseas drug money by buying illegally obtained land plots on the island.

The DSI claimed the men bribed local officers into issuing illegal title deeds for parcels of public land and also forced some local businesses to sell to them at below the market price.

However, doubts have since been cast on these allegations, as the prosecution's case against the gang seemed much weaker than originally suggested to the media at the time of their arrest.

The men were kept in custody pending a police investigation into "illegal assembly" charges and two cases involving former business partners who accuse the gang of threatening them out of their share of a business.

Dodgy titles: Sathorn Luangpatipat, the President of the Surat Thani Consumer Protection Association (CPA), recently warned that people considering buying property on Koh Samui risked receiving illegal land titles.

According to the CPA, information from the Samui Land Office suggests that just 10% of the developers operating and advertising in magazines and on websites are licensed.

K. Sathorn also said that these unauthorized developers often take advantage of their customers; he thus recommended that potential buyers make extensive inquiries and check the background details of both the developer and the property before contemplating signing a contract.

Once they have signed a contract, owners are obliged to accept the status of the property they have bought, even if the title is not legitimate, K. Sathorn said.

One example of a suspect deed is for land that has been illegally reclaimed. Samui residents recently petitioned the Forestry Department (FD) to inspect two cases of encroachment on mangrove forests on the island.

Sunthorn Wacharakuldilok, the Director of the Forestry Department's Forest Protection and Suppression Division, said the first plot had already proved to be illegal, while the second case was still under examination.

Land authorities and local administration officials have recently been urged to take stronger action against all illegal developers. Charoen Chanparn, a Koh Samui land officer, said that his office is already scrutinizing various development projects on the island, which may be deemed illegal and repossessed.

Checking out: On July 19, Ubonrat Suwanrat, 37, the owner of small money exchange and travel office in Bophut, reported receiving suspect travelers' checks from Morgan West Karrick, 30, from Norway.

Karrick exchanged four checks, each worth US\$100, taking away 14,000 baht in cash. Later that day, when K. Ubonrat presented the checks at a bank, she was informed that they were fakes and that she would not therefore be remunerated.


Samui police checked the island's hotel lists, eventually discovering that Karrick was staying in Chawaeng.

They visited him in his room where they found 10 books of forged traveler's checks plus the 14,000 baht he had received from K Ubonrat.

Karrick later confessed that he had bought the checks on Khao San Rd in Bangkok, but could not provide any details about the supplier.

He was remanded in custody.

Separatists 'masquerading as security force members'

he Southern Border Provinces Peace-Buildding Command (SBP-PBC) launched a public-relations campaign warning southern communities to keep watch for insurgents pretending to be security officials.

To get the message out, 10 military vehicles equipped with loudspeakers were dispatched throughout the restive region, following a gunfight between insurgents and authorities at the SBPPBC's strategic headquarters in Pattani's Sai Buri District. Five people died in the shootout, three of them security officials.

Insurgents were able to carry out the assault because they were dressed like officials. Two of the insurgents, Hassan Wamae, 24, and Yudeen Baka, 30, were shot dead by an army ranger unit.

SBPPBC commanders told a press conference that authorities had managed to retrieve at least 10 weapons captured by the militants during the attack. These include one .38 handgun, four M16 assault rifles, four machineguns and 180 rounds of ammunition.

Authorities arrested three suspects in connection with the attack.

School's out for poor families: A new study by the Educational Network for Children found that, in spite of guarantees of state-funded schooling for a minimum of 12 years, poor children cannot afford even basic

education because they are forced to pay mounting "special expenses" not covered by the government

The study discovered that the government covered just one baht out of every 10 baht of actual primary-education costs. The network said the government paid 1,100 baht per pupil per year for primary education, but parents had to find an additional 7,137 baht a year to cover the cost of "special expenses" demanded by schools.

These typically include fees for Internet access and special "activities", such as boy scouts and girl guides activities.

About 6.5% of families removed children from school because they could not afford special expenses, the study found.

Open University Professor Jittinant Dechakhupt said at a seminar on child development.

"Thai families' lack of interest in providing 'brain-education' toys to their young children could be a contributing factor in [the children's] inability to solve problems effectively when they grow up," she said.

Brain-education toys are those that teach children to solve problems, such as assembly kits, jigsaw puzzles, mathematical games or find-the-missing-part kits.

Toys for children from one to six years of age mainly focused on increasing physical strength, improving hand-eye coordination and enhancing dexterity, Jittinant said, citing a study conducted by the National Health Foundation among 1,580 households across the country.

Brain-education toys made up only 35% of toys provided for children from one to three, and 36% for children from three to six, she said.

Duangjai Khoosriwinij, the head of the Association of Thai Toy Industries, called on the government to push forward a project to build at least one "toy library" in every district in Thailand.

Capital crime: A man who shot four people dead, wounded three others and damaged seven ve-

hicles after an argument with his ex-wife last year has been handed a death sentence.

The Saraburi Court found Anuchai Noithai, 41, guilty as charged, after witness testimony and evidence showed he had prepared a shotgun, gasoline and a letter for his parents in case he died.

Anuchai's defense of mental illness was deemed weak because medical reports indicated that he suffered from depression and stress, not clinical mental illness.

Although Anuchai pleaded guilty to 15 counts, the court viewed pleas as resulting from his failure to overcome damning evidence. They therefore declined to reduce his punishment as is normal with guilty pleas.

In court was Anuchai's exwife Somneuk Morya, who survived the rampage. She said she was pleased with the decision, as justice was served.

On the night of April 27, 2005, after failing to make up with K. Somneuk, Anuchai shot her and seven other people. Among the four who died were Somneuk's daughter Parichart, her 70-year-old mother Khanthong and her 28-year-old brother Pradit.

Cancer statistics: Of the more than 50,000 deaths from cancer recorded in Thailand in 2004, Isarn accounted for more than any other region, caretaker Health Minister Pinij Charusombat told a seminar to mark the 54th birthday of HRH Crown Prince Maha Vajiralongkorn


The region accounted for 19,221 of the 50,818 fatal cancer cases, followed by the Central region (10,690), the North (10,174), Bangkok (6,648) and the South (4,085).

K. Pinij said the Ministry of Public Health needed to be "more proactive" in tackling cancer by encouraging the public to undergo examinations more regularly; more than 80% of the fatalities occurred because the patients sought help too late.


Liver cancer accounted for most of the deaths, followed by cancers of the lung, cervix, breast, colon and mouth.

The most frequent causes of cancer were food contamination by alphatoxins generated by fungi, overdone cooking from grilling and deep frying, unsuitable food preservatives, use of banned food coloring and certain chronic viral diseases, he said.

Free screenings for cancer were provided at the seminar venue, a cancer center in Udon Thani Province.



ome 248 years ago, the "It is commonly observed, that when two Englishmen meet, their first talk is of the weather; they are in haste to tell each other what each must already know, that it is hot or cold, bright or cloudy, windy or calm."

Well, some of you are not Englishmen, so I have, almost by Divine Right, carte blanche to talk about the weather until the cows – or buffaloes – come home.

"Let me tell you about winds," as my very patient English friend once began. "There is a whirlwind from southern Morocco, the aajei, against which the fellahin defend themselves with knives. And there is the ghibli, from Tunis..."

Some years later, this conversation came to mind when what was merely a gentle zephyr caressing the island on the drive to Patong's Sala Bua restaurant – part of the Impiana Phuket Cabana – had gone through the stages of being a moderate breeze to just about as close as Phuket gets to strong wind by the time we set down at the car park.

Continuing the meteorological theme, a stern English look freezes the security guard to the spot before he has the chance to say, "Can *not* park," or for, that matter, "Hail, Andy," to which I would have replied, "No, it looks like rain..."

The Sala Bua staff gently direct our party of three into the heart of the restaurant, just after the sun has dipped below the horizon and the remaining vestiges of pink and orange alter to violet and finally dusky dark blue.

The color scheme inside is an appealing mix of earth tones and dark woods, which are easy on the eye and guaranteed to relax the diner, well, these diners anyway.

We meet Ronnie Macuja, the Exec Chef and a bit of a legend as far as Phuket's dining goes. His warmly generous na-

ture and enthusiasm for food bowls us over.

Nothing appears to be too much trouble for this multiaward-winning chef; he is soon tempting us with a host of delights from the menu, though not before inviting us to sample a cocktail or

The younger of my two companions decides not to try a virgin cocktail, but goes for a swift Coke. We older diners sample Margaritas – one is the scrummy "traditional" version, a real pearl of a drink – while the other is a "golden", which bestows the mouth with the extra warmth of an aged tequila.

Downed in a sec. We order another brace.

Our waiters and waitresses for the evening – under the guidance of Chef Ronnie – suggest a plate of three starters for us. This is a splendid idea, an idea that is surpassed by the reality, the holy trinity that arrives a few minutes

It's a bit of a struggle to know where to start. Dip into the roasted pumpkin and prawn risotto first? The Caesar salad served with Canadian bacon and goat's cheese? Or the scallops served with green-lipped mussels?

The decision is made for me when, inveterate gentleman that I usually am, allow the ladies to go ahead of me.

Scallops it is, and I smile inwardly, sure that this must be the best of the three.

But then ... a few mouthfuls of the slightly-sweet risotto and I muse that, actually, that's the best. And the same happens with the Caesar salad. My indecisiveness returns with a pleasant vengeance.

Sensation overload is already approaching – and we've only just started. The satisfied sighs of epicurean enjoyment around the table galvanize my thoughts into words into understatement. "This is rather good, isn't it?"

The band strikes up in the corner, thankfully not sounding as if it is merely tuning up. A string of hits - and no misses - performed at a discreet volume round out the comfortable silences as we eat.

The choice of our main course is left entirely up to us. "Duck," says the elder of my two companions to which I reply, "Why?" just before the bread roll thrown by a child at a neighboring table connects with the back of my head.

Momentarily stunned by this unwarranted assault, I catch sight of the lights of the fishing boats bobbing up and down they'd hardly bob side to side, I suppose - on the sea. "Fish" springs, fairly leaps, to mind.

Sea bass steamed in Maldon salt is for me, a delectably thick salmon steak for Companion 1 and a feather-tender minute – as in 60 seconds, not size - steak for Companion 2 are our choices, presented, naturally, with seasonal turned veggies.




Scallops served with green-lipped mussels.



sports car quite often overlooked here in Thailand is the excellent Nissan 350Z. True, this is no supercar in the Ferrari/Porsche/Lamborghini mold. But, priced below 5 million baht, it is surprisingly good value.

Nissan's principal market for the 350Z is, not surprisingly, the US, where the Datsun 240Z, its pioneering forerunner, became such a big hit.


The original 350Z was launched four years ago in the States and made its debut in Europe two years later. In 2005, a 350Z Roadster was added to the range.

A combined total of around 160,000 of these cars have been sold worldwide.

The Nissan is powered by the award-winning 3.5-liter V6 engine producing, in the latest version, a healthy 295bhp (218 kW), up from the initial 276bhp of the earlier model.

Voted one of the best engines in the world for a record 11 years in a row by the influential *Ward's Auto World* magazine, the motor is acclaimed for its smooth power delivery. An allalloy, 24-valve twin-cam, the engine will rev to a screaming 7,000rpm, with peak power arriving at 6,400rpm.

All this equates to a 0-100kmh time of 5.8 seconds (6.3 seconds for the Roadster) and an electronically-limited maximum speed of 250kmh.



To rein in the abundant power, the 350Z is equipped with lightweight Brembo ventilated disc brakes – four-pot at the front, two-pot at the rear – and speedsensitive power steering. Drive is through either a five-speed automatic transmission or a six-speed manual gearbox.

The auto model also offers Tiptronic manual control.

Electronic brake-force distribution (EBD) is standard, as is Brake Assist, the system that detects emergency braking and increases line pressure in conjunction with the ABS. The interior is not large, but adequate for

what is essentially a two-seater sports car. Leather abounds and there is a sophisticated sound system. For safety, six air bags are fitted.

As with the original 240Z, the three center-mounted ancillary dials are angled toward the driver, just to remind the owner



of the 350's heritage. Aluminum surrounds for the air-conditioning controls add a touch of class and there is a host of oddments bins around the cockpit, including fully-trimmed door pockets incorporating bottle-holders. There is also a lidded compartment behind the seats that is large enough to hold a briefcase.

In Japan the 350Z is raced in the Super GT series, with drivers Richard Lyons, the 2004 champion, and Germany's Michael Krumm in the lead car, and Satoshi Motoyama and Tsugio Matsuda in the other.

Lyons, who himself has tried to break into the major leagues of motor racing, in both the States and his native Britain, replaces Sakon Yamamoto who is leaving to join the fledgling Super Aguri Formula One team.

In Thailand, the Nissan 350Z is distributed by Siam Nissan Automobile Co, and sells for a remarkable 4.8 million baht.



Cool cocktails from the Man on Chumphon Rd

few months ago, Thanarat Kityakarn, better known as Powerman, a DJ on local radio station, 89 Power Zone, opened an outdoor restaurant on Chumphon Rd opposite the police station.

Korn Non, or "Before Bedtime" as it translates, offers a selection of food as well as coffee, fruit juices and beers in a quiet atmosphere with music chosen by Powerman himself.

Of all the items on the menu, Powerman – or Man for short – is most enthusiastic about his selection of frozen cocktail shakes.

He has more than 10 varieties all made from a mixture of fruit juices and the North brand of vodka, which is distilled from rice.

He experimented with gin and brandy before finally settling on vodka, ordered specially from Bangkok, which he says give the cocktails a mellow flavor to suit the style of his bar.

All the fruits used in the cocktails are freshly squeezed.

K. Man recommends Cha-Ba Baan (hibiscus in bloom) and Phuket Ever Green.

Cha-Baa Baan is a distinctive cocktail, the sweet taste of the strawberry mixing well with the tang of the lime juice and the vodka gives it a slightly bitter edge, making the tongue tingle.

Ingredients, for one serving:

North vodka	1oz
Strawberry juice	2oz
Fresh lime juice	1tsp
Syrup	1/2OZ
Ice	1 glass

Method:

Blend and filter the strawberries. Use only the juice. Add the remaining ingredients and shake well before pouring into a whisky tumbler.

The next cocktail, the Phuket Ever Green, is a bright, almost fluorescent, green color.

"We called it Ever Green



because, well, it's green", K. Man says.

This apple-based cocktail is very sweet, more like a candy bar than an alcoholic drink. The vodka is barely noticeable behind the strong apple flavor.

Definitely one for those who like their cocktails mild.

Ingredients, for one serving:

The ingredients are similar to Cha-Baa Baan, but using apples in place of strawberries:

North vodka 1 oz Apple juice 2 oz Fresh-squeezed lime juice 2 tsp Fructose syrup $\frac{1}{2}$ oz Ice 1 glass

Method:

Core, peel and blend the apples. Use only the juice. Add the remaining ingerdients and shake well before pouring into a whisky tumbler.

All cocktails are priced at only 50 baht a glass. Korn Norn is opposite the police station on Chumphon Rd and is open from 6 pm to around midnight. For more information call Tel: 01-5842529.

dvertising for skin whiteners is at fever pitch on Thai TV. Envious teens with a slight tint in their skin quiz snowy-white TV friends on how they got so white. At the supermarket, checkout staff zap a paper-white customer; it turns out that there are now high-tech gizmos for measuring skin whiteness – and you can never be too white.

It's not just your face that must be white if you're to be a trendy young miss these days. Armpits, too, should reflect light the way the Alps do. If the ads are to be believed, the effect of revealing a sparkling armpit is apparently so stunning that gobsmacked young men will pour ketchup accidentally into each other's laps.

The cosmetics companies have also recognized that, in targeting women, they are missing half the potential buyers. So now products such as Men's Bioré are



targeting the chaps. Gotta have a white face, lads, if you don't want to be regarded as a total hick. And, if the Bioré ad is to be believed, having a whiter face means you play basketball better,

White skin may boost one's self esteem – no one wants to look like a peasant who spends her days toiling in the fields – but are all these creams and other treatments good for you?

Dr Saksit Kritalukkul, skin specialist at Phuket International Hospital explains that there are two basic types of skin whitener: those that alter skin cell structure and are available only from medical practitioners such as himself, and over-the-counter lotions available from any beauty shop, pharmacy or supermarket.

The prescription treatments include topical creams and laser therapy.

Some of the creams block the synthesis of melanin, the substance that gives color to skin. Others go further, by also augmenting the body's natural ability to get rid of excess melanin.





Lasers may be used in many ways, Dr Saksit said – "that would be another book entirely" – but one use is to break up the melanin deep beneath the skin.

But, he warns, "These medicines are a double-edged sword – they have advantages and disadvantages. Some have side-effects, mostly allergic reactions. The severity of the reaction will depend on the therapy used and the susceptibility of the user to allergies."

The over-the-counter creams, he says, are mostly bleaching agents, descendants of remedies used by the ancient Greeks. They are, he believes, generally safe. The only real danger lies in overusing a product, which may cause skin irritation.

The other thing to bear in mind is that people with naturally light skins are more likely to get skin cancer from exposure to the sun – melanin, which gives a person a darker skin, forms a natural barrier to harmful solar rays.

It stands to reason that those who whiten their skins, whether through the use of the over-the-counter preparations or by having a specialist apply medical treatments, also heighten their own risk of contracting skin cancer.


That said, few of those who hanker after a white skin are likely to go lie in the sun.

The phrase "bleaching agent" may conjure up image of a chemical used for cleaning toilets, but Praew Jitapunkul, Senior Product Manager in Bangkok of French shampoo and cosmetics company Garnier, says, "Our product is made from lemon essence.

:. "We look for the best natural ingredients and undertake considerable research to make sure that our cream is gentle on the skin and will not irritate it. The formula we sell here is made specifically for Asian women.

"The products are tested by our own dermatologists to make sure of this. In addition, Garnier Light has a sun protection factor of SPF 15 to protect the skin from sunshine."

he spa at the Central Kata Resort is the newest branch of the nationwide Centara Spa chain. Treatments are designed as antidotes to the stress of modern life, combining ancient Eastern healing and relaxation techniques with Western rejuvenation practices.

Entering the spa, I was greeted by the gentle scent of aromatic oil burners, assuring me that I had come to a true place of relaxation.

Spa Manager Monchanok Sung welcomed me. She has more than 10 years' experience in spas and has been working at this spa for two years, beginning when it was known as the Chiwit-Chiwah Spa at the Jiva Resort. The resort was taken over by Central Hotels & Resorts in May this year.

K. Monchanok took me on a tour of the facilities. Centara Spa has four massage rooms – three single rooms and one for couples. For those wanting to splash out, there is also a private suite that includes a sauna, jacuzzi and shower. Outside, looking over the pool and gardens, is a corner with foot-massage sofas.

The rooms are sparsely furnished with just a treatment bed, to minimize distractions. The rooms are decorated differently, but each has wooden paneling and soft lighting, giving off a calm earthy feel. Paintings, ornaments and flowers grace the walls.

Including K. Monchanok, there are four therapists at the spa. The same styles of massage are offered in all nine branches of Centara Spa.

K. Monchanok recommended the popular "Tranquility Massage" that, according to Centara Spa's pamphlets, will, "reconnect mind, body, and soul using slow flowing movements to

gently lull the body and senses into a greater state of relaxation." It sounds almost like a religious experience.

The massage comes with a choice of essential oils.

I opted for "Tropical Retreat", a mixture of sage, rosemary and mint, as it is claimed to help lower mental stress and strengthen the memory, which is never a bad thing.

Three other oils are also available: Thai Romance, a concoction of ylang ylang and lavender designed to uplift the spirits; Siamese Bliss, consisting of lavender, sweet orange and lemongrass, which purportedly re-



lieves fatigue and clears the head; and Floral Sanctuary, a jasmine oil that "relaxes and renews".

K. Monchanok explained that the therapist would press on and massage the lymphatic system and blood vessels, thereby improving circulation.

The massage would also makes my skin appear younger and healthier, she said.

She suggests that people should go for a massage about three times a week to improve the circulation, but not more often than that – the effectiveness of the massages decreases if practiced more frequently.

She also advises that people should not sunbathe immediately after massage as the oils combined with sunlight could lead to burning.

My therapist was to be K. Monchanok herself. The style of massage is different from that of other spas, focusing on the lymph nodes and spine.

K. Monchanok spent about 30 minutes massaging my back before moving to my legs. I felt warm, as if I could feel the blood being moved around my body.

Her experience shone through in the massage. It felt as if her hands were transferring energy to my body as they softly but surely manipulated my back. It seemed as though she was totally focused on my relaxation.

Unfortunately, as the saying goes, time flies when you're having fun and the 90 minutes of the massage were over all too soon. At only 1,100 baht, this is among the least costly hotel spa treatments available on the island.

The Tranquility Massage is one of the most popular treatments on offer at the spa. Other treatments available include foot massages, manicures, mud wraps and facials.

Centara Spa also has couples' packages including the "Romantic Interlude" which lasts three hours, costs 5,200 baht and includes a Tranquility Massage, a body wrap and an organic Jurlique facial.

The spa uses only Jurlique products in its treatments.

Central Hotels & Resorts currently have a special Mother's Day offer of a free 60-minute massage with every room booked by August 7 for a stay between August 10 and 16.

Head for the hills and a bowl of hot noodles

hat views, what service, so exclusive. We realized that this was certainly *the* place to eat.

Our bamboo sala had just two small tables, surrounded by four chairs and a scattering of Thai cushions on the floor – and offered some of the most stunning views of North Thailand's rugged landscape that we had ever seen.

We had just traveled some 35 kilometers to reach this restaurant – it really is amazing just how far people are prepared to travel to eat sometimes.

Located high in the Doi Chang hills, the quaint village of Ju Jee faces north, overlooking the Mae Kok River valley below and vast, seemingly endless hills beyond.

Our journey started earlier that morning in Chiang Rai. From there we headed northwest along the river bank, eventually passing the large Karen hill tribe village of Ruamit on its northern banks.

There we stopped and watched as a train of elephants slowly wound its way over the

hills, so far off in the distance they looked more like ants than the enormous creatures they were.

Then we went on to Pong Nam Ron Hot Springs, where we managed a late breakfast on the river bank. Chai, the owner of an excellent food-vending stall, boiled eggs for us in the steaming, sulphury spring water.

The eggs were very hot – and pungent – but not really to be recommended, despite K. Chai's insistence that they impart mystical powers to those who dine on them.

"Also encourages great potency," he chuckled, mentioning in passing that he had six children

From there we shifted our rented vehicle into four-wheeldrive mode; the now unpaved road wound its way through the forest, still following the fascinating river that flows from the village of Thaton down to Chiang

How to get there

Fly from Phuket to Chiang Rai, connections for which are available from several domestic carriers. For my trip, I flew Phuket-Bangkok-Chiang Rai on One-Two-Go by Orient Thai, at a one-way cost of 3,400 baht, excluding airport tax. With good connections and reasonable service, this seem to be the best deal available right now.

Renting a vehicle

There are several good rental agencies in Chiang Rai. Make sure you rent a good 4WD vehicle for such a trip – and consider hiring a driver if you are not as intrepid as us. My favorite rental firm is North Wheels, Chiang Rai branch (Tel: 053-740585; Fax: 053-740588; Website: www.northwheels.com).

Note: It is essential that you speak a little Thai – enough to ask for directions en route. Don't get discouraged; many hilltribe people only speak their own language, but most villages will have at least one Thai speaker.

Where to stay

There are many options in Chiang Rai. The Golden Triangle Inn, in the center of town, offers excellent value with rooms starting at 650 baht per night. They also have a good tour company, Golden Triangle Tours, that offers excellent overnight trips to such areas (Tel: 053-711339, 053-713963).

My Dream Guesthouse is located in the small Karen Village of Khaew Waaw Dam, approximately 25 kilometers outside Chiang Rai on the banks of the Mae Kok River. Rooms with riverside views start from just 400 baht per night. Great riverside restaurant/sala. Sometimes closed for short periods during the low season, so check availability in advance; (Tel: 053-609033; Website: www.mydreamguesthouse.com; Email nan@mydreamguesthouse.com)

Rai, beyond which it eventually spills into the Mekong for its journey south to the sea.

A fleet of bamboo rafts passed us, heading toward Chiang Rai

Loaded with both tourists and supplies, these rafts were on one of several overnight trips offered by tour operators in Thaton, which have an overnight stop in one of the hill tribe villages en route. Although a little commercialized these days, it is still well worth the trip – if only for the river journey itself.

After a short stop for drinks and a rest at the My Dream Guesthouse on the river bank, we drove across a suspension bridge and began our ascent into the hills – and what a climb it was.

No maps here – and certainly no road signs – just offroad tracks snaking ever higher into the hills. These tracks – it is probably too generous to call them roads – connect the many hill tribe villages still high above us.

The only way to navigate or get one's bearings here is to stop the occasional passing motorbike and ask the rider for the way.

Fortunately, most people were able to direct us to the next baan or village – where we

stopped and asked for more directions. However, in these parts, distances, times and road conditions seem to take on a slightly different meaning. Nothing ever seems definite and the phrase "the blind leading the blind" best describes the feeling one starts to get.

It was with some relief that we eventually found our way to our first major hill tribe village, a Lahu settlement nestled into the hillside. Local children, pigs, dogs and chickens all mingled around as we asked which track to take next.

All the villagers pointed high into the mountains beyond – and told us to keep going. One chuckled a bit and shrugged his shoulders when we asked how long it would take.

On we climbed. At 1,400 meters, we broke out of the forest. Here the road began to climb even more steeply, with deep ravines at either side.

We carefully edged our 4WD along the narrow ridge until suddenly, there in the distance,

we could see our destination: Ju Jee – a Lahu village perhaps 30 small houses, all built of bamboo and perched tenuously atop a small peak. There is no electricity here, apart from that generated by some newly-installed solar panels, which were proudly displayed in all the gardens we passed as we made our approach.

We had finally reached our lunch spot – the exclusive restaurant with the spectacular view. Needless to say, half the village came out to greet us, looking at us as we ate and even sitting with us – but I guess that's half the fun.

Oh, yes. The meal was delicious – by far the most delectable bowl of "Mama" instant noodles that I had ever tasted. Happy travels.

ne of the most charismatic characters of Phuket, Fabio Ferlini, has died at age 59 after a short, swift bout of cancer.

If you were in Phuket in the late '70s and early '80s, and dined at any of the rustic Karon Beach restaurants, chances are you will remember the long, tall Italian holding court each evening.

Fabio arrived in Phuket when he was in his early 30s, after spending much of his adult life up to then travelling the world.

He sought out beautiful spots in South America, Europe and Indonesia before landing on a stunning, undeveloped Karon Beach.

Long-time friend Sek Sung-Kaew was 9 years old when he first saw "the long European man walking on the beach". He remembers how Fabio immediately immersed himself in the daily life of the village, learning to speak Thai and taking part in local ceremonies and celebrations such as Loy Kratong and the Vegetarian Festival.

In later years, Fabio told K. Sek that when he had arrived on

Karon Beach, gazed at the sunset and felt an incredible universal energy, he knew that this was "the end" – this was the "last place" for him.

It was evident that he felt this way because, unlike many of the expats who arrived during the same period, Fabio never left his beloved island, except for short holidays. He may be one of the few people to have lived here continuously since the early '80s.

He built with his own hands traditional Thai wooden bungalows on the land of the Sung-Kaew family – not once, but twice.

The first time it sat where the Hilton Phuket Arcadia now is. When the land was sold for development, he dismantled the house and rebuilt it in its current location, surrounded by a lush garden – his pride and joy.

Plants, insects and nature in general were a focal point for much of his interests and he spent many hours looking after his garden.

Fabio Ferlini was born of a prominent family and raised in the center of Verona, Italy, in a house surrounded by vineyards. He was a hippy in the '60s, complete with long, curly hair, and mingled with the cinematic figures of the day,

including Federico Fellini. He even appeared in a Franco Zeffirelli film as a golden, godlike figure.

After leaving Verona, he spent time in Rome then Brazil, Denmark (where he married a Danish woman and had a son), Amsterdam, America and many other places.

One thing that allowed him to travel so freely was his gift for languages. Fabio spoke many languages well, including English, Thai, French, Portuguese and Spanish, and could also communicate adequately in others.

This gift was very useful in the aftermath of the tsunami, when he tirelessly translated for and comforted many survivors at Provincial Hall in Phuket City, the center of volunteer efforts in Phuket.

In recent years, Fabio indulged his long-time interest in holistic, Eastern-based forms of therapy and herbal remedies. He studied reflexology, massage, Chinese medical theory, and colon cleansing regimens, among others.

He used his knowledge and expertise not only for his own health and well-being, but also to help and heal others. For years he offered free massage therapy and advice to ailing villagers.

Fabio was an enigmatic man of many contradictions. Even though he was a vegetarian, he never lost his love of all Italian food and at a party he could frequently be found next to the meat platter.

He was an extremely wellread intellectual, yet had the common touch and could chat up even itinerant workers.

He was known by many, but was also a deeply personal man who rarely shared his private thoughts.

Fabio always provoked a reaction in people and could never be ignored. As Sek Sung-Kaew said, "Everyone always noticed him."

esides howling factual mistakes, Jake Needham's last thriller, *Killing Plato*, was marred by the puerile misanthropy typical of self-loathing expatriates.

He deftly side-steps this defect by making the hero of his fourth novel a native Singaporean. In *The Ambassador's Wife* (Prime Crime Press, Hong Kong, 2006, 349pp), Inspector Samuel Tay is a 48-year-old veteran of the Special Investigations Section of the CID (Criminal Investigation Department). Oddly enough, he is always complaining about the heat – "nasty, sweaty, stinking hot" – which is like an Eskimo complaining about the cold.

Nonetheless, Sam Tay immediately enlists the reader's sympathy because he is laboring under a horrible secret: he is terrified of blood and gore. And his job is to inspect murdered corpses. Why does he do it? He can't exactly say. He is wealthy, thanks to an inheritance from his Chinese-American father. He graduated as a top student at National University and then, inexplicably, chose police work.

"Looking back on the decision he had made as a young man, he could not for the life of him remember now exactly why he had made it; but regardless of the reason, he had stuck with it."

MORE CHEAP CYNICISM

His new case puts all his powers of endurance to the test.

The nude corpse of a woman is found in an unregistered room in the Marriot Hotel. She has been shot in the ear with a .22 pistol, her face mashed to a pulp, thighs spread obscenely and a flashlight jammed between them. The murder scene has been professionally wiped clean. No clothes, no clues, no nothing.

Then an FBI agent named Tony DeSouza, legal attaché at the American Embassy, turns up at Tay's house on a Sunday with the information that an Interpol fingerprint check identified the corpse as that of Elizabeth Munson, wife of the American Ambassador to Singapore, Arthur Elliot Munson III, who is on a return flight from Washington

DeSouza assumes the murder is a terrorist attack. Tay, who does not, gets his first clue when he learns from a former high-society girlfriend that Elizabeth Munson was having an affair with another woman.

Tay is off on the chase.

Needham's strengths come to the fore here: crackling dialog and a keen eye for detail. There are several clever red herrings

An identical murder in Bangkok brings Tay together with the Embassy's Regional Security Officer, the beautiful Cally Parks. First introduced as a blankfaced bureaucrat, she turns positively coquettish in Tay's presence. She drives Tay down to Pattaya to interview a retired spook named John August, owner of the Baby Girl Bar. August dismisses the terrorist angle and reveals that the Bangkok victim was also a lesbian.

The Thailand section is flawed by large doses of cheap cynicism:

"To tell the truth, Tay didn't like anywhere in Thailand very much. Beneath its veneer of exotic temples and saintly monks lay the dark heart of a country that lived off greed and sex. No matter how you tried to dress the place up, Tay thought, Thailand would always have the soul of a whore."

Apropos of Bangkok:

"In the hard white light of the swampy coastal plain, the city lay before them like a spreadeagled tart on a rumpled bedspread."

The pace is also slowed down by a number of annoying and pointless side plots that add nothing to Tay's character except to make him lose credibility.

The same can be said for other improbabilities: that's he's only vaguely aware of Pattaya and utterly ignorant of Singapore's Orchard Towers (the "Four Floors of Whores") – which is like a policeman in the 1970s being

oblivious to Bugis Street. These flaws could be forgiven if the book ended in a slam-bam surprising climax. It doesn't. In the climatic scene back in Singapore, the prime suspect is indeed guilty and promptly confesses. In the final chapter, the obvious mastermind is exposed. Both are taken care down by the *deus ex machina* of August John.

It's a limp, lame end to what starts out as a rousing thriller.

Jake Needham had his readers hooked and then let them off the line.

Maritime sports rules must be kept clear and simple

Not so long ago, the only major sporting event on the waters around Phuket was the annual King's Cup Regatta. The Ao Chalong Yacht Club had its regular weekend races, but they were mostly for local sailors and all the boats were locally-based.

The competitive scene grew with the start of the Phang Nga Bay Regatta and then, three years ago, Phuket Race Week, deliberately timed to take advantage of monsoon season weather when wind could be virtually guaranteed – solving a problem that dogged the other two events.

Now it seems that the rest of the boating world is discovering the delights of Phuket. The F1 circuit, which canceled a planned race when the tsunami threw everything into confusion, is coming after all, in 2008. Added to this are two more new events. The Rubson Raid Turquoise, a sort of seaborne Gumball Rally featuring high-powered inflatables, will arrive this December. There has also been an announcement by the organizers of the world championships for fast two-man Tasar dinghies, who have set their sights on Phuket as the venue for an event in July next year.

The Rubson Raid was going to be held around the Cape Verde archipelago, off the western coast of Africa, but, the organizers announced, "With the safety of the competitors and the event always uppermost in our minds, it was clear that a new choice needed to be made..." That choice was Thailand, specifically the Andaman coast.

All of this is good news for the island. For a start, such events bring to the island hundreds of people who fill hotel rooms, eat in restaurants – and possibly even buy OTOP goods.

Perhaps more important than the immediate economic benefits is the positive exposure Phuket receives from international TV, newspaper and magazine coverage.

Footage of the King's Cup is already distributed to more than a dozen TV channels from Australia to Europe to South America, projecting a glamorous image across the globe.

The F1 race and the Rubson event will likely receive even greater coverage, given that they feature fast and furious action, which makes great footage for the armchair sportsman and potential tourist alike. Some 50 print journalists and 20 TV crews are expected to converge in Phuket to cover the Rubson Raid alone.

As the provisions of the new dive business regulations will also apply to boat racing competitions held in the province, let us hope that officials involved will clearly understand the significance of these events – and make the red tape as easy to navigate as possible.

'Overestimated' RoI will reflect badly

I am about to retire, and, after many pleasant holidays in Phuket, I have decided to buy a property there.

On a recent visit, I was

struck by the emphasis now being put by nearly all developers (aided and abetted by the real estate agents) on "Return on Investment" (RoI).

On examining the figures, it is clear that the rental use has, in most cases, been grossly overestimated to come up with the required RoI figure, with no evidence given in justification, no track record, and often no marketing organization in place to obtain the required rentals.

The problem with this approach is that it will attract people who buy mainly as an investment, and who have little intention of living there.

If and when such investors realize the returns promised do not materialize, then many will sell their "investment" and move their money to a better return. The effect on Phuket property prices will not be pleasant.

Some of the bigger, or more enlightened developers seem now to be including a hotel in their development or establishing links with a hotel.

This will improve the rental use, but many projects will not achieve the RoI advertised and this will reflect badly on the industry in a couple of years' time.

The right to protest, but in the right way

FIRST PERSON

t's every provincial governor's worst nightmare. A call comes in that a road has been blocked by a group of langry protesters, who demand that he come to the protest site immediately to hear their grievances. Such protests put the Governor in an awkward spot.

He is not an elected official, but rather an appointee of the central government, serving as its highest-ranking representative in the province. Thus, his duties include maintaining law and order – even if it means mobilizing the police to forcibly disband demonstrators.

Here, Phuket Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura talks about his approach to dealing with such protesters in general and two recent protest cases in particular: the blockage of the Thepkrasattri Rd in Thalang by villagers of Baan Kor En and a sit-in protest by villagers on Pra Baramee Soi 8 in Patong who refused to vacate homes they had built on encroached-upon land.



have to first listen carefully to what the villagers want so that I can understand the root cause of the problem. That is my rule.

Once I have done this, I try to find the best way to solve the problem. However, villagers should make sure they protest in the right way, not doing anything that violates the law.

The right to protest is enshrined in the Constitution, but that doesn't give protesters the right to break the law.

I simply don't agree that people have the right to do something "wrong" in order to achieve what they view as a "greater good". I will not allow them to do that, and if they break the law, then I will refuse to negotiate with

Both sides need to exchange opinions in a reasonable fashion, with a view to making the other side change their stance.

That wasn't the case in some recent protests, such as at the Phra Baramee Soi 8 protest and with the Baan Khor En mob, because their actions troubled not only the government, but also the public at large.

In the case of Phra Baramee Soi 8, people there constructed dwellings on a private individual's land without first seeking permission from the owner. Then they simply refused to leave, using their children's welfare as a negotiating point.

here are 74 species of mangrove tree in Thailand, providing both food and shelter for many living organisms. The soil in a mangrove forest is similar to that of a tropical rainforest.

The nutrients in the soil are very close to the surface and in both rain forests and mangrove forests, the trees have very shallow root systems.

The mud is an important part of the food chain, which depends on mangroves later down the line.

First of all, the mangrove trees break up waves. Once the disturbance caused by wave action has ceased, the fine particles in the water, combined with mangrove tree bark and leaves, form sediment, in which algae grow. This is the start of the food chain. The algae are food for snails.

Decomposed leaves are food for crabs and prawn. The decomposing leaves and bark are also eaten by bacteria and fungi.

The tide carries the nutrientrich particles out of the mangrove forest into deeper water, for example, Phang Nga Bay. This becomes food for plankton, algae, and later for the mangrove trees themselves as well.

Mullet – a species of fish very common in Phang Nga Bay - also feed on the decomposing leaves. In fact, the amount of protein generated directly from the eating of decomposed mangrove leaves and bark is much higher in mangrove forests than in any other environment in the world.

ROOTS

The tangled roots of mangrove trees provide small fish with shelter from bigger fish; the little fish hide in the root system to keep from getting eaten. This allows them to survive to become bigger fish, at which point, they will try to catch smaller fish.

Mangrove forests are the breeding grounds for hundreds of species of fish. Many of these fish species are very important to commercial fishermen.

Birds, too, rely on the mangrove trees for food, in the form of insects and flowers found on the trees. Both terrestrial species and sea birds frequent the forests. The most common terrestrial bird species found in southern Thailand feeding on the mudflats and in the shallow water include Pacific reef egrets, Chinese pond herons, common sandpipers, little herons, common redshanks, rufous-necked stints, and a few other less common species.

Sitting in the mangrove trees watching for fish or prawns are a variety of kingfishers. The brown-winged kingfisher, blackcapped kingfisher, common kingfisher and the collared kingfisher are the most common. At least 204 species of birds have been recorded in Thailand's mangrove

Spiders live on the trees, too, hunting other insects, and bats can be found hanging out in the caves in mangrove areas. One of the most important species of bat to live in the mangrove forests is the fruit bat. Though

The stunning diversity of the mangrove forest



fruit bats can be found in other habitats, the mangrove is an important environment for them.

If you like durian, you should like fruit bats because they pollinate many kinds of durian. In fact, they are the sole pollinators of some species.

Soldier crabs can be seen by the hundred at low tide. Fiddler crabs and several other species share the mudflats with them.


Fifty-four species of crabs have been recorded in the mangrove forests of Thailand. Crabeating macaques eat the crabs. So do birds and otters.

All of this eating on the ground is being watched from high above by birds such as brahminy kites and white-bellied sea eagles. They eat other smaller animals in addition to

So, the next time you're lucky enough to be in a mangrove forest, take a minute to watch all the life that depends on this very special environment.

Smart home solutions for homebuyers and developers

omebuyers looking for the latest in convenience and functionality, and developers wondering how to differentiate their properties should consider installing smart-home systems into new houses.

The general public is becoming more and more aware of smart homes through television programs and glossy magazines that highlight how families take advantage of home automation.

Most of the smart-home equipment on the market

today uses proprietary technology which tends to push costs higher.

However, there is a small but growing number of manufacturing companies in the homeautomation market creating products and systems that use standard technologies and Open Source software. In the hands of a good integrator this allows equipment to be mixed and matched to create better smart home solutions than proprietary systems and at a much lower cost.

As with other markets, standardization will lower systems costs and a more competitive market will benefit us all. One of the best sites on the Internet for seeing how this works is www.homeseer.com.

The website showcases the latest technologies and has informative articles and links to just about anything you could need to automate your home.

The cost of installing smarthome infrastructure into a new house is small compared to retrofitting it to an existing property. Wireless technology is becoming more and more reliable, but guaranteed connectivity is still the domain of real wires.

For most people a home represents the biggest investment

> they will make during their lifetimes. Builders and developers know this, and want to make sure the home behaves in a reliable manner through the normal use of switches, buttons and sensors.

If a smarthome system is installed and fails to behave as designed, then the dis-

gruntled owners are likely to complain, spreading bad news around the community, and tarnishing reputations.

Builders, therefore, must be sure that the equipment is robust and reliable, that the smart-home system will be thoroughly tested and verified by the installer before it is handed over, and that there is a customer support package available to handle customer's problems when they crop up.

For home owners it is going to be "mission critical" that the home works properly. For example, when you want a hot

The new home buyer or builder may not want to install a smart-home system with all the equipment in a new house all at once, because this adds significantly to cost.

However, any new home should be fitted out with a well-

designed and structured wiring system to accommodate home automation in the future. It's usually best to install a small or modest smart-home system to begin with, thus allowing everyone to get used to it.

With systems that work successfully, sooner or later the occupants want to expand the system to include additional features or to control other parts of the house.

If the system has only proprietary interfaces and software, then the home owner has no choice but to use the original installer for the system upgrade or expansion. In addition, if the home was not fitted with structured wiring from the beginning, then these upgrades and expansions will require significant re-cabling which can be very costly.

So it is important to take time to ensure the infrastructure or structured wiring system is left flexible to accommodate standard interfaces and a range of competitive solutions available on the market.


DESIGN

Home buyers and developers can differentiate their homes by installing structured wiring systems during construction. It is also important to design the wiring infrastructure carefully to accommodate standard technology and present-day requirements but also possible future needs. Integrators and installers should install smarthome systems that use standard technology, so customers are better served in the long run.


Before paying the final bill, be sure that the system is well documented and works as intended, and that a suitable maintenance and support contract exists to deal with any problems in the future.



Bright colors of flower show mask low turnover

he show of flowers at the 14th Annual Phuket Flower and Plant Show at Saphan Hin from July 17 to 26 was as spectacular as ever, but the bright colors masked tough times for the plant and garden business, which is suffering, sellers say, from the current poor economic situation and increasing competition.

After 10 days of the show, which featured displays by some 80 businesses of all sizes, few of the exhibitors were overjoyed by the money they had made.

Orawan Chanprasert, 26, owner of Thanapon Garden, which opened on the bypass road three years ago, has joined the fair every year since.

She told the *Gazette*, "My income from the show was about half what it was last time. I think it was because there were many more stalls this year, while the number of buyers was about the same.

"My average turnover was about 6,000 baht a day – a total of 60,000 baht over the period of the show –and my profit was half what it was last year. I even dropped my prices about 30% from what I charge at my garden center, but sales were still slow.

"The number of garden centers in Phuket has increased a lot; you can see them on every road on the island."

However, the news is not all bad, she said. "I came here to find more customers, and the stall fee was cheap; it was only 3,000 baht for whole fair.

"[At the garden center] my customers

in the past were generally hotels so the period before the high season was usually the best time for me.

"Now I'm beginning to get good business in the low season as well, thanks to the growing number of property developments,"

Pornpilart Raktae-ngan, 44, from Phuket Chemi-Kaset Phan (Phuket Chemical and Agriculture) on Thepkrasattri Rd, agreed that the flower show was disappointing. "I heard from all the sellers that they were not making good profits. I think that is because of the poor shape of the economy and rising fuel prices, which have made people reluctant to buy [plants].

DUMPING

"I didn't raise my prices – I cut them from last year – but I still couldn't match my show turnover last year, which was about 20,000 baht a day. This year my best day was only 5,000 baht.'

Sawitt Niyomthong, 28, from Suan Sawitt Garden in Pa Khlok, who also has another garden center in Ratchaburi, complained about out-of-towners dumping at the

"Many gardens from Bangkok came and they set their prices so low that it ruined the market for anyone else selling orchids – or other plants, for that matter. We just could not compete on price. The other factors were the poor economy and rising fuel price. My daily turnover last year was about 8,000 baht, but this year it was half that amount."

K. Sawitt also complained about the high cost of doing business in Phuket. In Ratchaburi, his hometown, he said, it cost about 400,000 baht a rai to set up a garden center but in Phuket the cost is about 600,000 baht.

"Here everything is dearer – the transportation, the labor cost – and on top of that the price of plants is high as well," he added.

Wirat Kanankhao, 54, owner of Wirat Phan Mai on Phun Pol Rd, agreed that the number of stalls was a major factor in his poor sales this year.

"Last year I sold plants worth about 300,000 baht during the fair, but this year I sold about 100,000 baht," she said. "There were many sellers from the other provinces and they had a greater variety of plant than us."

But although her profit was disappointing, she still felt that coming to the show was worthwhile. "It's a good opportunity to meet new customers even though many people just came to look and then said that they didn't want to buy now because they feel plants are an unnecessary luxury."

Not everyone did badly at Saphan Hin. Suk Chuaysakul, 52, has traveled up from Songkhla to join the fair in Phuket every year

"I got about the same amount as last year," she told the Gazette, "about 100,000 baht for the 10 days. The reason my sales were better than other people's, I think, was because in my garden I have many plants that are different from those that other people sell."

Variety, it appears, is the spice of commerce in the market-gardening field.



he hope and ultimate intention of every investor is simple: to make money. While the majority of investments in a healthy

market will achieve this aim, the inevitable combination of volatility, adverse situations or poor returns often tests patience to the limit – causing some investors to opt for bank deposits as a safer and less stressful alternative.

Any individual who wants to learn more about investments can take the simple route of turning on one of the business channels on television, such as CNBC or Bloomberg. There, 24 hours a day, you can watch interviews with fund managers, who discuss their approach to investment.

Usually, if stock markets are going in a negative direction or the outlook is uncertain, fund managers will mention increasing investment in bonds – and sometimes in cash. The average interview usually consists of a mention of three asset classes: equities (investment in a corporation through the stock markets); bonds (with fixed interest returns) and cash (bank deposits).

For financial institutions with billions or even hundreds of billions of dollars or other currencies to invest, these three options – or a combination of them – represent the choices available.

ADVANTAGE

For the individual investor, the situation is actually much more attractive; it sometimes is an advantage to be small in relative terms because it certainly increases the range of choices available. Among my favorite investment instruments - one unavailable to institutional investors – are ground rents. Ground rents as an investment option are, briefly, investment in real estate assets in the United Kingdom.

Ground rents are thought to have come into being between four and five hundred years ago. During this period, the nobility and aristocracy owned most of the land in the country, including large tracts that are now large towns and cities. To finance expensive lifestyles, it was necessary for the upper classes to devise a solution so they could retain their land while generating income from it.

The solution? They offered long-term leases, typically for a minimum term of 99 years. A small number of leases were for 299 years and an even smaller number for as long as 499 years. In return, the leaseholder was able to build a house on the land – but he had to pay a ground rent for the duration of the lease. This payment had to be made, otherwise the entire property, including any buildings on it, would be legally repossessed.

The leaseholder could approach the owner to buy the lease; in some cases, terms were mutually agreed upon and freehold ownership resulted. In reality, however, a significant percentage of urban property in the

UK today is still held on a leasehold basis.

The financial standing of the British nobility has in general spiraled sharply downward over the centuries. Even financially conservative members of the nobility faced difficulty when they found themselves targeted by socialist government policies that came into being after World War Two. At that time, the Labour Party government introduced "death duties", now known as inheritance tax, at very high lev-

The result was that very few members of the nobility were able to retain their castles and

The very nature of property changed, with former estate lands ending up in leasehold agreements. These now exist over a multitude of property types, from apartment blocks and factories to office towers, department stores and even foreign embassies. All these leaseholders have one thing in common: they must pay the ground rent in order not to lose

It was an American, a woman from Louisiana, who saw the opportunity that this situation presented. She had been a professional fund manager in Europe for 25 years before seizing the opportunity to turn ground rents into a vehicle for investment.

She tested the concept of ground rents for several years in the early 1990s by managing her own independent brokerage fund, attached to a pension fund. After confirming that the theory worked in practice, in February 1996 she created her own fund management group, Brandeaux, and launched the Brandeaux Ground Rent Income Fund.

Its success was instant. Very shortly after its launch, I was fortunate to have the whole concept explained to me in detail by a Regional Sales Manager

from UK insurance giant Royal & SunAlliance, which had acquired the distribution rights to the original fund. I realized that this was an investment opportunity unlike everything else available – anywhere. It was, and still is, unique, offering a net return of between 8% and 10% annually – regardless of the vagaries of economic cycles, the state of the property market or any other fac-

The performance of the fund has been strong, meeting some very high levels of expectation with average annualized returned a profit of 165% between its launch and July, 2006. Since its inception, it has never experienced negative performance – and this is true of every fund that Brandeaux manages.

In the early years of the fund, Brandeaux focused only on the ground-rent situation. Recently, however, it has been revealing a more long-term strategy. It has been buying properties in the most expensive areas of London with a view to taking advantage of what it refers to as "significant reversionary interest".

In other words, leases are approaching maturity in some cases, and the capital gain is going to be enormous.

Brandeaux recently gave an example of an expensive apartment block, where the total return was 35% annually. Of course not all such investments will have such robust returns, but the Brandeaux strategy is nevertheless a superb one.

This is an outstanding investment vehicle for retired people or for anyone wanting to hold a truly safe investment. The fund deals once a week. Although the entry cost is listed at 1.5%, one large financial institution has extended its offer of just 1% until the end of this year. Even better, the returns to investors are completely tax free, there are no exit charges, and investment can be in either Euros or US dollars.

Three provinces give green light to Rubson Raid

PHUKET: The governors of Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi have all agreed to allow the Rubson Raid Turquoise Thailand 2006 competition to take place in and around the three provinces.

Phuket Governor Udomsak Usawarangkura signed an agreement on behalf of all three after a video conference with his counterparts in Phang Nga and Krabi on July 26.

The Rubson Raid, an annual event, features teams of four competing in identical high-speed inflatable boats.

According to the event website, it will feature, "navigation contests and speed trials (of 50 nautical miles plus) ... even a water-ski relay event". It will also have "... land-trekking competitions, adventurous 'happenings' in the mangroves, walking and swimming races".

The three governors all agreed that the event would be good for tourism. Speaking after the video conference, Gov Udomsak noted that the organizers have already reserved 200 seats on flights to Thailand for the teams and he hoped that "a lot of tourists" would come to watch the event.

He also pointed out that the teams would have to buy fuel locally, putting money into the local economy.

The competitors themselves will not stay at hotels during the raid. Instead, they will be based aboard the clipper *Star Flyer*, which will ferry them from one event venue to another.

So far, 14 teams out of the 25 invited have confirmed their participation. The maximum number of teams that will compete will be 20.

Belgian Philippe Martin, who devised the Raid four years ago, is expected to come to Phuket in August for more discussions to cover details such as safety and fuel supplies.

Evason Race Week ends in crescendo of weather

AO CHALONG: Despite fore-casts for light-to-moderate winds, squalls gusting over 30 knots, driving rain and large waves marred the start of the final race in the 3rd Evason Phuket Race Week regatta on July 30, after three days of the best yacht-racing weather Phuket has seen in years.

The near gale winds tore the wind speed meter off the top of *Switchblade*'s mast, and the downpours restricted visibility to 50 meters as yachts approached the first mark.

The Classic class race was canceled and the light Firefly catamarans, *Moto Inzi* and the recently launched *Chi Machine*, stayed safely in port. However, yachts still in the running for top honors or for more points in their classes were willing to brave the adverse conditions.

David Lindhal's *La Samudra* managed to stave off several attempts at overtaking by John Vause's *Ruby Tuesday*, to secure another win, giving the Phuket-based yacht five wins from six races and victory in the IRC 1 class.

Craig Murphy and his crew on *Switchblade* sailed well to place third in the class.

In IRC 2, Mick Kealy's Minx secured a crucial victory on a shortened course over Stuart Crowe's Cinders to win the class on a count back. Despite George Foose and his crew on Free Wind putting in a fine performance to finish third in the final race, their efforts were not enough to snatch third place overall from Jim Kane on Chetak.

As the Sports Boat Racing class had completed six races before the final day, they were not required to sail in conditions that were decidedly dangerous for the smaller craft.

Former world junior sailing champion Scott Duncanson scored a perfect record of six wins from six races on *Somtam Express* to win the class, with Jim Poulsen's *Lee Marine Vino*



some of us are prouder than others of the epithet with which we were saddled at birth. Thais have a great system in this regard, with babies being given nicknames that reflect their characters in the first few days of their lives. It's a system that makes

As ever, the western world thinks it's far too advanced for that kind of simplistic logic, and is riddled with parents who insist on "demonstrating their child's individuality" (I almost want to do that double-fingers-in-the-air thing) by bestowing on the child the most ludicrously embarrassing moniker they can summon up.

These people are obviously totally oblivious to the fact that the hapless child will inevitably grow up, having to explain the weird name to people he or she meets at work and in the pub for years to come.

For originality you could always go with Heavenly Hiraani Tiger Lily (the daughter of Paula Yates and INXS singer Michael Hutchence) or maybe Peaches Honeyblossom, Pixie, or Fifi Trixibelle (the daughters of Yates and Bob Geldof). Or traditional favorites such as Frank Zappa's offspring: Moon Unit and Dweezil. These rock star types.

Demi Moore and Bruce Willis have three children running around: Rumer, Scout, and Tallulah. Sylvester Stallone's innocent little angels are Sage Moonblood and Sistine Rose, and Ben Affleck's son is Indiana August. Jamie Oliver, a British celebrity chef who really should know better, has a daughter by the name



of Daisy Boo. What are these people on?

And what about these ridiculous spellings that have started to crop up recently? If you want to name your child Christina then that's all well and good. But it's spelt C-H-R-I-S-T-I-N-A. Not a difficult concept, one would have thought.

Christina makes a phone call to her bank, they ask her name, she gives them what they want: "Christina Jones". And they write it down. Easy.

Actually, there's a slight problem. Her parents decided in their wisdom that it would be much more "interesting" for her to be called "Krystyna". Try explaining that to millions of bank clerks without getting bored. "Well, actually it's… aaargh."

The plant world, sadly, has more than its fair share of dodgy names. Well not so much dodgy as mysterious, with nobody being able to pin down who originally came up with it the name, or why.

The frangipani is a case in point. Frangipani aficionados have been arguing for years over the source of the plant's most common name. Some say it was inspired by an ancient perfume from Italy. Others are insistent that it was named after the white sap that oozes from its cut stem.

There are even experts (quite what they're expert in I'm not sure) who claim it reminded early French visitors to the West Indies, the original home to the plant, of "frangipanier" – coagulated milk. Who knows? Come to that, who cares?

Something else that makes the frangipani stand out is the long list of alternative names: plumeria, temple flower, dead man's finger, egg flower and cayenne jasmine are just some of its alternative epithets.

In Thai, it's a lanthom. Or

it was. The trouble with *lanthom* is that it sounds like *rathom*, a sad word, and because of this it was shunned by most people, because of the possibility that having it in one's garden might bring sadness into one's home.

Over the past few years, HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn has managed to reverse this perception, by promoting the name *leelawadee* instead. Another name!

A few weeks ago, the dreaded durian was given honorable mention in this column. Frangipani is a little like durian. Not because it smells as if it's emerged from the depth of Satan's inner crevices (the opposite is true in fact), but because you can smell it before you see it.

In the world of fragrant plants, the frangipani reigns supreme. It emits an incredible smell, vaguely similar to a rather expensive perfume, but better. The frangipani's waxy flowers have a particularly tropical fragrance.

It's found in many Thai gardens these days as a decorative tree, although it has to be said that the tree itself is nothing to write home about and is a bit of an ugly duckling.

It looks gnarled and stunted,

as if it can't quite decide in which direction to grow. It's the flowers that make the tree so appealing. The dramatic flowers always appear on the ends of branches, sometimes giving the impression that the inner parts of the tree are just there by accident; a kind of afterthought.

In Phuket, the frangipani flowers almost non-stop year-round, appearing in an almost endless number of varieties and colors. The most fragrant variety of frangipani is probably the Singapore plumeria, with its brilliant white flowers, always with five petals, but with varying shapes.

Other varieties and colors include pink, red and yellow, and delicate mixtures of these on some hybrids.

Luckily, the frangipani is extremely easy to grow in any Phuket garden or pot. If you like the look of a friend's or next door neighbor's frangipani, all you need to do is cut off a branch and stick it into a well-drained pot full of rich soil.

SHOCK

It will look a bit miserable and mope for a while and most of the leaves will shed. Once it gets over the initial shock, however, it will liven up and grow rapidly. It might even bloom during the rooting process, though the bloom doesn't indicate that it's fully recovered yet; you might want to cut off the flower so the plant devotes more energy to root development. It is healthy leaves, rather than flowers, that indicate healthy roots.

The frangipani isn't particularly fussy about how much sun it gets in its initial stages, but it does need a fair amount of water early on. Once it gets going, it requires very little care, and because it's a sun-worshiper, it will be happiest in the sunniest position in the garden.

Worldwide, the frangipani is associated with a number of different religions and cultures. Many Southeast Asian Muslims plant it in their cemeteries, and Hindus use its flowers as temple offerings. In Hawaii, ceremonial *leis* (welcoming garlands of flowers put around the necks of guests) are made from the frangipani. It is also a feature of many Thai temple gardens, too, as you'll see all over the island.

Here in Phuket, most of us enjoy the frangipani for what it is — a natural air freshener that doesn't look half bad either. At least it's not called "Daisy Boo" or "Krystyna". That would just be silly.

Mr Oliver, I hope you're taking note.

Phuket Asialand Co Ltd builds on success

New luxury six-story apartment block for Surin Beach

ollowing the success of its first project, Surin Sabai, Phuket Asialand Co Ltd has launched new apartment and villa developments in Surin Beach and Cherng Talay.

A six-story, 35-apartment block, along with two villas, are being built next to the existing five-story, nine-apartment Surin Sabai project.

Construction of another development featuring 12 standalone villas in Cherng Talay called Chernglay Villas – is due to start in September this year.

Michel Chiappetta, the Director of Phuket Asialand, said that the two apartment developments constitute the first phase of the company's projects.

The other two are Chernglay Villas and a third development Mai Khao Asialand at Mai Khao Beach – which has yet to have a start date assigned.

Phase 1 is on 3.5 rai of land at the foot of a hill some 400 meters from Surin Beach.

Construction of the nineunit block began in June last year and took 11 months to complete. The block is now occupied.

Mr Chiappetta said that the six-story block – which will comprise 17 studios apartments, four one-bedroom apartments, three 2-bedroom apartments, nine three-bedroom apartments and two penthouses, will be complete in December 2007.

Prices begin at 2.2 million baht for the studios, 5 million baht for the one-bedroom units and 7 million baht for the three-bedroom apartments.

"Prices vary according to the floor and the view the buyer has from the apartment," noted Mr Chiappetta, adding that one of the three-bedroom penthouses, which are priced between 19 mil-

lion and 20 million baht, has been

The penthouses will have their own terraces and swimming pools, and occupiers of the other units will have access to a com-

All residents will be able to use the fitness center and restaurant that are included in the de-

Phase 2 – Chernglay Villas - will be near Wat Cherng Talay on Pasak 4 Rd, about 2 kilometers from Bang Tao Beach.

This development of threebedroom "Thai-style" villas will be on seven rai of land. Each property will have its own swimming pool and parking space for two cars.

"We will start to build the two show houses in September this year, and we will have the sales office there.

"Prices will range from 18 million to 23 million baht each and although the villas share the same basic design, individual buyers can alter the specification.


"For example, they can ask for an extra bedroom," he said.
