# Foreign teachers face crackdown

PHUKET: Schools across the island have asked Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit to petition the Ministry of Education (MoE) to ease new regulations requiring all new foreign teachers to have at least a bachelor's degree and to pass an extensive background check before they can begin work.

The decision to approach the Governor was made at a meeting at the Phuket Educational Service Area (PESA) office on October 31, chaired by Niran as one of his last acts as Vice-Governor before his promotion to Governor.

At the meeting, attended by representatives of 37 private schools and 14 government-run schools on Phuket, it was agreed to ask the Governor to petition the MoE to also allow teachers to work while the lengthy background checks are being conducted.

Owners of small private schools employing foreign teachers, especially language schools, feel the new requirements, which came into effect September 29, are too restrictive and time-consuming, taking months to complete before a new teacher can be hired.

The new policy requires that all foreign teachers possess at least a bachelor's degree, a certified copy of which must be presented to the local MoE office along with a certified copy of the applicant's academic record.

Before hiring a new teacher, schools must wait for approval from the MoE's International Education Promotion Division, which must check the

authenticity of the teacher's credentials by seeking a confirmation letter from the university the applicant claims to be graduate of

The new policy specifies three other requirements:

- The applicant must possess a passport with a non-immigrant visa of any class, except for an "ED" study/education visa. The visa must be valid for at least 15 days before the date of application;
- The name of the teacher must match that on his/her passport and academic degree;
- Teachers from countries where English is not an official language must present evidence of English-language fluency, in the form of standardized test re-

sults with the following minimum scores: IELTS 5.5; or TOEFL 550 or TOEIC 600.

Gov Niran said that, apart from security concerns, there are many foreign teachers in Thailand who lack proper teaching credentials.

The crackdown is likely to affect Bangkok, Chiang Mai and Phuket the most, as these are the provinces with the greatest concentrations of foreign teachers, he said

PESA Director Chien Srirueng confirmed that the bachelor's degree and background checks apply only to new hires, not existing foreign staff.

There are currently 105 foreign teachers in Phuket, employed by 35 different schools.

# American caught with fake 'visa'

PHUKET CITY: Following an American man being caught with a fake permit-to-stay submitted with his work permit application, the Phuket Provincial Employment Office (PPEO) has warned all foreign workers — and the companies that employ them — to remember that forgery of Immigration stamps and documents is a serious crime.

At the "Governor Meets the Press" meeting at Phuket Provincial Hall on November 6, PPEO Chief Boonchoke Maneechote announced that people found guilty of producing Immigration stamp forgeries will be prosecuted, with offenders facing from six months to five years in prison, a fine of 1,000 to 10,000 baht, or both.

The warning followed the September 19 discovery of a forged permit-to-stay stamp in a work permit application of American Jeremy Loud. Boonchoke said that Loud, 33, applied for a permit to work for DPic Imaging Ltd Partnership.

The application was submitted to the PPEO by Phuket Visa & Accounting service.

The American had granted a power-of-attorney to the manager of Phuket Visa & Accounting to apply for the work permit on his behalf.

When the applicant went to pick up the work permit, however, a PPEO officer noted that copies of the applicant's permitto-stay stamp failed to match the stamps in Loud's passport.

The office therefore refused to issue the work permit, contacted Phuket Visa & Accounting to inform them of the Continued on page 2

apparent fraud, and reported the matter to police.

Nattasorn "Somjet" Eadkanan, Managing Director Phuket Visa & Accounting, told police that the company had hired "freelance" agent "Nong Man" to handle the work permit application on the company's behalf.

"We hired him because we were busy and he had a perfect record with other jobs we gave him in the past. So when he prepared the documents for me, I signed them all without checking every page and submitted them myself to the Employment Office," Somjet told the *Gazette*.

Neither himself nor the American had any way of knowing that the application contained copies of fake permit-to-stay stamp, he said.

Somjet confirmed that Nong Man was a civilian and not a Thai government officer. Efforts to contact Nong Man at his Phuket Villa California home or by telephone have thus far proved successful, he said.

"I think he knows he has been found out," said Somjet.

### **HAZY DAYS**

PHUKET: The haze that descended on Phuket November 1 was the result of cool temperatures and rain, which combined raised relative humidity to 100% and created fog, the island's top weatherman has said.

Chumnong Chitpukdee, Director of Southern Meteorological Center (West Coast) Phuket, said that during the "fog", land and sea transport should proceed with caution. "The 'fog' will have no effect on high-season tourism," he added inevitably.

However, the haze, found all along Thailand's Andaman Coast, continued to hang over Phuket on November 7.

### B1m murder fugitive arrested in Phitsanuloke

PHITSANULOKE (*The Nation*): Fugitive murder suspect Thai-American national Saner Wonggoun was arrested November 3 in Phitsanuloke province.

The former US Air Force non-commissioned officer pleaded guilty to a murder charge filed by local police in California for the murder of his pregnant wife Sopha in 1994, police said.

The arrest came just seven days after Thai and US authorities announced a one-million-baht bounty for information leading to Saner's arrest.

Police initially located Saner two days earlier, following a tip-off that a man resembling a police sketch of Saner was selling charcoal at Khoke Matoom Market. After a two-day stakeout, police approached the subject and brought him to a local police station for further questioning.

Saner's identity was later verified by various documents issued by Thai and US authorities, including Thai and US passports and a bankbook.

Deputy Police Chief Gen Issaraphan Sanitwong na Ayutthaya said Saner had signed an agreement for his extradition to the US.

The bounty will be given to the Thai police by US authorities, but the officer did not say how much the informer who provided the crucial tip-off would receive.

Saner said he had contemplated suicide several times, and felt as if he had died the

day after he killed his wife.

"I have been living in misery all along. I have been living on given time. No happiness or anything at all," he added.

He had never withdrawn any of the three million baht he earned through serving in the USAF, for fear he could be traced, he added.

Saner said he killed Sopha out of rage after learning that she was eight months pregnant, despite living nearly a year together without sex

He said he had hit her on the back of her head with a hammer while she was watching television and their two children were out. He later dumped her body 50 to 60 kilometers from his home.

### Pian begins Barami 8 evictions

KALIM: Patong Mayor Pian Keesin on November 6 reluctantly agreed to demolish three squatters' homes on Soi Phra Barami 8, the site of a proposed road-widening project that has been delayed by the numerous illegal dwellings there.

The three houses are among 61 that face destruction, but are the only dwellings that the court has ordered demolished.

Mayor Pian agreed to demolish the homes at a meeting at Kathu District Office chaired by Phuket Provincial Chief Administrative Officer (*Palad*) Nivit Aroonrat, who has long sought removal of squatters from the hill-side area.

Most of the 61 families who face eventual eviction from the area work in low-paid jobs in the Patong tourism industry; many have children who attend school there

Their electricity was cut when they were served their eviction papers last May by provincial officials, who were accompanied by some 100 police and security officers.



Three of the 61 squatters' homes on Soi Phra Barami 8 were to be demolished November 10, to make way for a road-widening project.

Two months after receiving the eviction notices the squatters not only refused to move, but also staged an angry protest at Phuket Provincial Hall, where they demanded a delay in the eviction, negotiation of a fair resettlement and restoration of electric power.

The province, represented by Nivit, took a hard line with the villagers after they rejected a plan to be resettled on small plots of land owned by Wat Kathu, some six kilometers away. Saying that the time for negotiation in the case had passed, Nivit ordered Mayor Pian to demolish the three dwellings.

As of November 5, each of the three homeowners had run up 137,000 baht in fines for defying the court order to vacate. If unable to pay the fines, each face a one-year jail sentence, he said.

The three targeted dwellings fall most directly in the path of the intended roadway widening project.

The province wants them to relocate first so that the owners of 12 other dwellings in a group of 15 targeted for immediate relocation will follow suit and will not need to be served with court orders.

Nivit said it was time that the province showed the encroachers that it is serious about the evictions.

"Patong Municipality must first deal with these three cases, because the villagers are still there despite the court order. I don't want to ask the court to issue orders against the other 12.

"We need to do this in order to set an example and prevent more problems later on," he said

Mayor Pian first asked to bring in the Justice Ministry's Legal Execution Department to advise and help negotiate a "step-by-step" solution to the problem, but in the end agreed for the three holdouts to be demolished on November 10.

Numerous police units, including members of the local Police Border Patrol Unit, are expected to provide security during the operation.

#### Killer to be transfered to Bangkok

PHUKET CITY: Briton Paul Chetwynd-Talbot is still being held at Phuket Prison, though he is expected to be transfered to the more comfortable Klong Prem Prison in Ladyao, Bangkok, before the end of the year.

Paisarn Suwannaraksa, Chief Warden at Phuket Prison, told the *Gazette*, "It will be more comfortable for the prisoner because he is a foreigner, and easier for friends or relatives to visit. [Klong Prem Prison] is also near the UK embassy, which is more convenient for embassy staff to visit their national in prison."

Talbot, 32, was jailed at Phuket Prison, on Damrong Rd, on May 24 after being sentenced to 10 years for murdering his girlfriend, Debra O'Hanlon, on July 31, 2005, in the Patong room the couple shared at the time.

### Beaches fail '5-star' award

PHUKET: Visitors seeking a "five-star" beach experience in Thailand will have to head to either Krabi or Satun, as none of the eight beaches in Phuket monitored by the Pollution Control Department (PCD) will be awarded the coveted "5-Star Tourist Beach" rating for 2006.

Dr Pornsook Chongprasith, Director of the PCD's Marine Environment Division, said that only three beaches of 105 monitored this year received the top rating: Adang Island Beach in Satun, and Haad Yao on Phi Phi Don and Bilae Beach on Koh Hong, both in Krabi.

Phuket should take heart, though. The three beaches were the first ever to get the five-star rating under the program, now in its fourth year.

The PCD will post the ratings on signs at each beach to raise public awareness and encourage residents to keep them pollution-free and attractive.

The beaches were subject to quarterly monitoring and numerical values assigned to beach-

quality indicators, such as water quality (bacteria counts), local land use, the amount of litter on the sand and under the water in a random sweep, and the presence of sand dunes.

Dr Pornsook told the *Gazette* the results of the five-star beaches had been confirmed, but that final results and rankings for all the other beaches were being double-checked.

The final results will be posted on the PCD website in a few weeks' time and the signs updated by the end of the year, she added.

PCD Environmental Scientist Saisunee Chaksuin said that preliminary, unofficial results of the eight Phuket beaches monitored in 2006 indicate that all will receive either 4 or 4½ stars.

Patong, Surin and Nai Yang all maintained the four-star ratings assigned to them in 2005, while Karon Beach stayed at 4½-stars, largely because of the presence of sand dunes there.

Four other Phuket beaches were monitored for the first time: Kata Yai (4 stars), Nai Harn (4½), Kamala (4½) and Bang Tao (4).

Jimmy Carter visits tsunami-hit village

TAH CHAT CHAI: Former US President Jimmy Carter on November 1 visited villagers at the north end of the island who lost their homes to the tsunami. New homes were provided for them by Habitat for Humanity, a charity headed by Carter.

Villages gave a heartfelt welcome to Carter and his wife Rosalynn, who were accompanied by US Ambassador to Thailand Ralph Boyce, Habitat for Humanity International CEO Jonathan Reckford and Dr Chainarong Monthienvichienchai, chairman of the Thai board of Habitat for Humanity.

During his visit, from 11:30 am to 1:30 pm, Carter inspected some of the 96 tsunami-recovery homes the foundation built. He also spoke to villagers about their income and how they felt about their new abodes.

Seventy-one of the homes were built using interlocking soil-cement blocks made by the villagers themselves under a "livelihood development" project. Some of the homes, however, still do not have toilets.

Carter autographed several bricks and even lent a hand in using the press used by villagers to mold the bricks.

The 20 houses closest to the Tah Chat Chai shore are on wooden stilts and cost about 120,000 baht each to build.

The 71 homes built with the blocks cost about 95,000 baht apiece.

#### **FOUNDATION**

"Many people lost their homes to the tsunami, and the home is the important foundation for the family.

"I have worked with Habi-

tat for Humanity for 23 years, and each year I spend one week helping people to rebuild their homes," Carter said.

"I want you to know that I – and a lot of people around the world – care about you and wish you happiness with your new homes," he added.

The Carters boarded a flight to India in the afternoon, bound for Lonavala, near Mumbai, where Habitat for Humanity is building 100 houses for homeless villagers.

## Are children getting what they need?

School food has – among certain nationalities – long been the butt of many a joke, almost to the same extent as airline food. Scarcely a Brit over 30 will not still emit a slight snigger at the mention of Spotted Dick, a steamed suet pudding containing dried fruit and usually served with custard, which has been a staple on lunch menus for decades.

However, taking Napoleon Bonaparte's famous maxim that "An army marches on its stomach", can it be said that a school educates on its?

The Gazette's Noolek Karaket, Tanisa Bunyasiwaand and Andy Johnstone look into the state of school meals in Phuket, both in the government and private sectors.

should "Breakfast like a king, lunch like a prince and dine like a pauper," that is, one should eat the main meal of the day as early as possible.

This may be sound advice for those looking to maintain a certain weight, but how does it apply to schoolchildren, most of whom are on the go all day long.

Do they receive enough nutrition from their school meals? Is it really the responsibility of a school – state or private sector – or the parents to ensure this?

One teacher at a local international school, who asked to remain anonymous, agreed readily that the school must take re-

and, as I know from colleagues

here is a saying that one in other schools, are more than happy to leave all responsibility to a school for their children's welfare – including food. If the school doesn't provide the meal, then who will?" said "Jilly".

She explained that in her four years of teaching in the state system in the UK she saw some of her pupils suffer academically because of a poor diet – and sees the pattern repeated here.

'There are two causes of the problem, and in all honesty I can state that as far as the UK goes and my school here, it is not that pupils are not informed of what makes a good diet and not that a healthy meal is not made available to them. They do know, and good meals are provided.

"It pains me to see children "Some parents at my school looking tired and hungry when they come to school. The parents

– or in too many cases, the maid have rushed them out of the house in the morning, stopping to pick up a snack from 7-Eleven, if they're lucky, on the way in.

"At least here [at the school] children have a choice of fruit and drinks at all break times as well as a range of salads, pasta, vegetables and meat dishes at lunchtime. Some students, however – especially teenage girls – have already started to be so weight-conscious that they skip this meal, too. It's so easy to spot the ones who don't eat; by midafternoon their energy has gone and their concentration is flagging. It affects their academic attainment, too. Many studies support this observation."


Tida Touawaluck is a dietitian at Vachira Phuket Hospital. She, too, is aware of at least a casual, if not a causal link between diet and attainment.

"The government recommends, and I support this, that children should eat five times a day, divided into three main meals and two healthy snacks. This approach is not unlike the 'grazing'

diet proposed in many Western countries.

"Children at school age," she said, "require a lot of protein to help their bodies and their brain cells develop properly. The nutrition they receive should come from protein, found in meat, eggs and milk. Of course, it's also vital that all food groups – grains, vegetables, fruit and fats – be well represented to form a balanced diet."

Tida explained that part of her role, in conjunction with the local education authority, is to visit

all state schools in Phuket twice a year to educate pupils on the importance of a good diet.

"I show them the right foods to eat, why good nutrition is important – and also to give them an idea of what can go wrong if they do not eat a balanced diet. I must say that I am sometimes disappointed with some of the choices available at school canteens.

'There is too much 'fast food' on offer," she noted, "or it is too easy for children to be able to buy sugary snacks that give them a quick rush, but later, when the effects have worn, make them feel more tired than they did before. Obesity, too, is an increasing problem in Thailand."

She noted, however, that many government schools that had been offering food of minimal nutrition value have improved.

"Healthy food campaigns, instigated by the local education authority and run in conjunction with the provincial public health office, have gained a lot of attention from pupils, parents and teachers.

"All parties concerned have started to be far more careful in terms of the foods selected. They are becoming interested in controlling obesity and malnutrition, relying more on fruit and milk snacks instead of cakes, and rice and meat products instead of french fries and chips.

"Next, however, I'd like to see fewer advertisements on TV for fast food. All the hard work I and my colleagues around the country do with schoolchildren is undermined by these commercials," she noted. "Junk food makes them fat and unhealthy."

The "eat-healthily" attitude is taking some time to filter through to all children, however, and with a few reservations, too.

One Year 7 student from Baan Samkong School said, "I eat lunch at school every day – it's always rice with some soup, curry, often chicken or fish, and vegetables; we don't have much choice – because my parents think it's good value and

"But I usually have a little money each day with which I buy fast food or candies with my friends. It's fun to do that."

The British curriculum International School (BIS) enjoys a good rapport and liaison between school and parents. Bongkotratana "Rose" Sathaporn, Director of Marketing & Business Development, and Natalie Murray, one of the "Friends of BIS Phuket", demonstrated a shared vision of

the importance of nutrional school dinners.

The 873 pupils, including about 170 boarders, enjoy a wide choice for midday meal, with little – if no – likelihood of revolution. Boarders, incidentally, have five meals a day at school, seven days a week.

In fact, it appears that BIS involves all parties in deciding what makes up lunch – as long as it is meets the exacting standards of the school nutritionist and the school nurse. Also, the BIS refectory meets the exacting criteria set down by the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH).

"We are subject to spot checks by the MoPH, as well as regular inspections by the local public health office under its 'Clean Food, Good Taste' rating system," said K. Rose.

"These ratings are to check that food served here is prepared hygienically," she added, noting that the best way of determining the popularity of dishes is by watching where the lines form at lunchtime.

'We have sections for international food, Thai and Asian food, as well as salads and fruit.

"It's almost impossible not to eat healthily here... Favorite dishes are the sesame chicken wings and the deep-fried pork. Some of the older boys pile their plates with both of those and noodles, rice and vegetables."

Natalie added, "It's very different from schools in the UK, where, due to a change in government policy some 25 years ago, local education authorities were forced to put the contracts out to public tender.

"The cheapest bids often won, and even now food is supplied at the cheapest possible price and in ready-made portions.

"The children here have no such restrictions. Everything is cooked fresh; all fresh foodstuffs - meat, fish, vegetables - are bought in daily."

Pupils, she said, also have a voice in the dishes offered. "The Student Council has suggested that lasagna be added to the menu. Our chefs - many of whom have years of experience in hotels – will create a number of versions, all of which will be healthy, and then [staff, Friends of BIS and the Student Council] have the arduous task of tastetesting them..." she added.

"Seriously, though, it is run like a military operation, and the 873 pupil meals each lunchtime do not include meals for the teaching staff, which puts it up to about 1,100 meals. Factor in occasional parents or visitors meals and the kitchen produces up to 1,500 lunches," said Natalie.

"One thing we are trying to change, however, is the inclusion of the amount of calories per dish on the menu. Calories aren't necessarily representative of the healthiness of a meal. Far better, we feel, to show the amount of fiber, fat, protein et cetera per meal on the menu."

Pupils, too, seem to value the meals offered, with pasta and rice dishes - as well as fruit being firm favorites.

Even Year 7 pupils see the wisdom of the school canteen being off limits until after lunch.

"I think a lot of children would go there to buy drinks and crisps if we were allowed to go before lunch," said one 11-yearold girl.

"But we're usually so full that we're not that interested. It's a good idea, and I really like the food. Spaghetti Bolognese is probably my favorite.

"I do lots of sport – most of us do – and we have lessons at school that talk about what we should eat.

"I know that carbohydrates and protein are really important, as well as fruit and vegetables, so I always try to leave room for them," she said.

"I suppose [pupils at BIS] have a bigger range of things to choose from than at government schools, but I don't know what I'd do if I went to one of them and could go out and buy things. Maybe I would. I suppose a treat is ok now and again.

### That'll teach him

n Nakhon Sri Thammarat's Thung Yai District, mystery surrounds the murder of a man who was found beaten and stabbed to death, his penis burnt to a crisp.

The grisly murder was reported to Thung Yai District Police around dawn on November 2. Arriving at the scene, in a rubber-tapping community in Tambon Prik, police led by Duty Inspector Pol Lt Col Leuachai Thongsin found the body of 31-year-old Wacharakorn Krainara in front of his home in Village 2.

Clad in a red shirt and black pants, the corpse was covered in deep slash marks. The victim appeared to have been beaten with a blunt object.

Police found a lit candle stuck on his forehead, along with extinguished candles in each ear and one more in his mouth.

Strangest of all was the victim's penis, or what was left of it. His killers had used a rubber boot as fuel for a fire to burn the sex organ.

Police didn't have to travel far to find a prime suspect.

Right across the street from the murder scene was the home of Rarn Klomsuk, quiet with doors shut and apparently unoccupied.

When the owner returned some time later, police asked to search the house. There they found bloodstained clothes belonging to Rarn's 30-year-old son, Preuksa. He was taken in for questioning, but denied involvement in the killing.

Preuksa's younger brother, however, told police that he was home the night before when Preuksa returned home with three or four friends, all drunk. The group sat in a *wong lao* ("whisky circle") and continued drinking at the home.

The younger brother left the home for a quiet place to sleep. Returning the next morning, he discovered his neighbor's dead body across the street.

Pol Lt Col Nithitorn Tanserisakul, Deputy Superintendent of the Thung Yai Police, said initial attempts to track down the other members of Preuksa's *wong lao* had failed.

Thung Yai Police Superintendent Pol Col Prasert Reeyaphan said that Preuksa and his friends were members of a gang of drug-addicted rubber tappers whose nefarious activities were well known to local police.

He suspected that the group, engaged in a drug-fueled drinking session at Preuksa's home, became enraged when Wacharakon approached them about the noise they were making.

Preuksa would be the first charged with murder and the others will follow after warrants are issued for their arrests and they are apprehended, he added.


The use of candles may have been to "trick" or "block" the spirit of the deceased from escaping the body and exacting revenge upon his killers, he surmised

There is a widespread belief in black magic in the area, he noted.

Naowarat Cheubaankoh, the 29year-old widow of the deceased, said her husband was a rubber tapper and a nephew of Pol Lt Col Siri Krainara, former Deputy Superintendent of the Thung Yai Police.

Her husband liked to socialize and drink alcohol, she said.

She had no idea why someone would want to murder her husband, she added. Source: Kom Chad Luek

n Chris Swift's words, "The worst thing I ever did in photography was to read a book about photography. It was called something like, How to Take Excellent Photos in 10 Easy Lessons, and was, of course, filled with the author's rules, not mine. In fact, it took me a long time to stop following other people's rules."

Chris, born in 1949 in Cairo, was working for a major law firm on Madison Avenue in New York City at the time – back in the '80s.


"This was the period of the so-called 'me' generation, and I was well and truly stuck in the vortex of it," he admitted. "In one chapter of the book it said, 'Before you take a shot, ask yourself what it is about the shot that you like. You'll then be able to take a better shot.'

"Well," said Chris, "I could never answer the damned question, so I didn't take the shot – or any others – for years. In fact it took the same length of time to return to photography as it did to figure out that the author was nuts. You want my advice? Simple. You like the shot, you take the shot. Period. And as for my feelings on *How to...* books, it's a little similar to the lyric from that Sunscreen song of a few years ago: 'Read the directions, even if you don't follow them...'

Chris, who has a new exhibition – "The Abstract" – running at Watermark Bar Restaurant until November 30, recalls that he found the "Greed is Good" ethos of 1980s New York too much.

"Sure, on the weekends, I'd go out shooting with black-andwhite [film] and [in] infrared. Even back then, I was very much into shooting abstracts.

"But the general oppressiveness of city life and the frantic hoards scrambling for money proved to be just too much. I worked enormous amounts of overtime, saved a pile of cash and left.

"I never went back and I've never looked back," he noted.

Chris, with his new-found reprieve from the rat race, chose to return to Cairo on a one-way ticket. "From my birthplace I traveled to India, Thailand and Japan. Travel changed me. Being exposed to so many vastly different ways and cultures over more than a year produced a person who was not the same as the one who left," he said.

"I knew then that I could never return to America to live. I didn't fit in anymore."

Chris chose Thailand as his



home. "It's a bit more relaxed here, and was especially so in 1992 when I settled, than, say, New York. I used to tell friends elsewhere in the world about the mai pen rai attitude, explaining that it's sort of like the Mexican concept of mañana – only without the sense of urgency," he added.

Chris said that his photography work has grown enormously since his early days in New York, as has the recognition of it from those intrigued by the way, as he put it, his "...eye catches the weirdness of the built world."

The recognition has been official, too. "In 2005, I was thrilled to have won an honorary mention in the United Nations International Photography Competition.

"Three of my works, *Spray* Pond 3, Spray Pond 6 and Cemetery 2 were selected out of around 130,000 photographs submitted from almost 170 countries," he said.

Chris's enthusiasm for "The Abstract" exhibition is infectious and, for anyone who has seen his earlier exhibitions at the Four Seasons Hotel in Bangkok,

BCIS Phuket or the Phuket Art Gallery just last month, it is a must-see.

"This is my newest stuff, none of which has been shown before, of my latest developments into minimalist abstracts," he

"I feel passionately that I have - as a writer might say -'found my own voice' with what is on display.

"The images display the beauty of decay in the built world: boats, cars and architectural forms in a state of disrepair or erosion or dilapidation.

"There is a greater percentage of photographs that I love on display than I have exhibited before, and a greater number and larger works than I have shown before."

After a sneak preview, it's impossible to disagree with Chris when he said, "The Abstract is a milestone in my life."

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## Charges dropped against Tak Bai 58

he Ministry of Justice on November 1 agreed to drop charges against 58 suspects in the infamous Tak Bai protest, as prosecutors have insufficient evidence to prove their guilt, Justice Minister Charnchai Likhitjittha said.

The decision was made after a meeting of officials from the Office of the Attorney-General and the National Human Rights Commission, which responded to calls from the suspects and human rights defenders.

"The decision is a part of efforts to bring justice and reconciliation to people in the three southern border provinces,' Charnchai said.

The 58 suspects were charged with illegal gathering and public disturbance after a bloody protest in front of Tak Bai District police station in Narathiwat Province on October 25, 2004.

Eighty-five people died in the effort to quell the protest, including 78 who died of suffocation during transportation from the protest site to neighboring Pattani province.

The Tak Bai incident invoked international outrage over the brutal crackdown.

Not all 58 suspects will escape the law completely, however. Officials have solid evidence to pin down some of them in connection with masterminding the protest to create trouble in the region, Charnchai said.

Teen rebellion: A riot broke out at Surat Thani Juvenile Observation and Protection Center (JOPC) on October 28 after a group of detainees from Nakhon Sri Thammarat province refused to be transferred to Surat Thani Young Offenders Institution (YOI), claiming they would not be safe there.



More than 100 police officers were needed to regain control of the Surat Thani Juvenile Observation and Protection Center after more than 100 prisoners protested the transfer of some inmates.

The proposed transfer followed an outbreak of fighting between rival inmates from Surat Thani Province and Nakhon Sri Thammarat the day before.

The Surat Thani natives involved had already been transferred to the YOI the evening before, and the Nakhon Sri gang members claimed they would be in danger if forced to rejoin

Around 10:30 am, the 42 inmates slated for transfer rounded up the support of more than 100 fellow inmates and gathered on the center's lawn, armed with

sticks and with T-shirts wrapped around their heads.

The caretaker director of the center, Phongsura Krainara, worried the situation could get out of hand, called for police reinforcements. About 30 minutes later, Damri Bunjing, Deputy Governor of Surat Thani, arrived at the scene accompanied by Chinorot Yongkiatkan, Chief Justice of the Surat Thani Juvenile and Family Court.

After assessing the situation, they agreed to bow to the protesters' demands, ordering them to be transferred to Nakhon Sri Thammarat YOI instead. However, when two vans from Surat Thani City Police and Surat Thani Immigration Police arrived at the prison to transfer the group, they refused to get in, claiming that they were scared they would not be safe with the police. The protesters said that they would go only in prison vans, but officers refused their request.

This enraged the group, some of whom ran and grabbed gasoline from the center's workshop and set fire to trash cans. Others locked themselves inside a building at the nearby Surat Thani Child and Youth Training Center building.

Pol Col Tesa Siriwatoh, Deputy Commander of Surat Thani Provincial Police, tried to negotiate with the protesters and ordered his men to keep a close watch on the situation. When he finally realized the protesters were not willing to budge, Col Tesa ordered his men to break open the doors to the building the inmates had seized.

Officers took about 10 minutes to lever open the doors, while being taunted by the inmates inside. When the doors were finally pried opened, the inmates ran out, trying to escape from the officers. Police then ordered everyone not involved in the protest to lay down on the ground before chasing down the 42 leaders until all were apprehended. At 1 pm, the group was finally sent to Nakhon Sri Thammarat YOI.

Speed seizure: Police in Narathiwat seized a total of 13,600 ya bah (methamphetamine) pills in two raids on October 28.

The first seizure was the result of cooperation between the Border Patrol Police Unit 44 (BPU44) and Sungai Golok District Crime Suppression Police. BPU44 Superintendent Pol Col Phayuha Butbongcoordinated with Pol Lt Col Somchai Tessanok, Deputy Inspector of Crime Suppression at Sungai Golok, to set up a sting operation to arrest a ya bah dealer in Samaowiroj

Officers arranged to buy 2,000 pills of the illegal stimulant. When the delivery man arrived, he was promptly arrested and the drugs seized. He was later identified as Tanesam Tanhino, 32.

From their investigations, police discovered the address of drug ring leader Jeh Useng Hagueling, 34, in nearby Tak Bai District.

Police raided Hagueling's house, placing him under arrest and seizing four more 2,000-pill bundles of ya bah as well as 17 blue plastic bags stuffed with a total of 3,600 pills.

Murder in the park: The body of Sarot Chahcha, 52, was found by relatives in a park only 100 meters from his home in La-ngu District, Satun, on the evening of October 27.

Pol Lt Col Yeun Phetchana, Duty Inspector at La-ngu District Police Station, arrived at the scene in Tambon Kamphaen after receiving a report from the victim's relatives.

Sarot had gone out to the park to meet someone after receiving a phone call at 9:30 pm.

A villager reported hearing what sounded like a single gun shot around that time but thought nothing of it, police said.

Sarot's body was discovered later that day. He had been shot once in the back of the head.

Police said they thought the motive for the killing was likely to be vengeance provoked by a personal dispute.

he Ministry of Culture (MoC) is seeking ways to stamp out the practice of young women dancing erotically at public events, after HM Queen Sirikit expressed concerns that some females danced inappropriately at a Buddhist charity event in Nong Khai

After Her Majesty's concern was relayed via the MoC, several authorities proposed measures to ban such dancing shows and a meeting was called with representatives from 84 organizations, all invited to brainstorm a solution to the problem.

After the MoC suggested that girls be barred from working as scantily clad product presenters and dancers at public events, Labour Protection and Welfare Department Chief Padungsak Thephasdin na Ayudhaya said prohibiting under-20s from working as dancers would violate labor rights laws.

Women aged around 20 were mature and had a right to work where and at what they wished, he said.

Organizers should do their homework before sending dancers to events or locations to ensure it was appropriate for them to appear; dancers themselves could use their own discretion and cultural knowledge to determine if what they were doing was tasteful, he added.

The Supreme Sangha Council also reportedly threatened to sack senior monks if they allow inappropriate shows at their temples.

The style of dancing under fire is known as "Coyote dancing" in Thailand, after the popular Hollywood film *Coyote Ugly* that was a big hit in Thailand after its release in August 2000.

Thai temperance: The Thai Health Promotion Foundation (ThaiHealth) announced it would spend 30 million baht encouraging communities to support festivals and important events without alcohol.

ThaiHealth was spurred on by the discovery that celebrations

ThaiHealth's Vice-Chairman Prof Udomsil Srisangnam said the foundation was already seeing positive results in pilot projects underway in 20 provinces. "Drinking is not a Thai tradition. Alcohol companies have long tried to mislead society on that one," he added.

In Lamphun, ThaiHealth was promoting alcohol-free funerals. As well as reducing alcohol abuse, dry funerals were an average of 20,000 baht cheaper.

Lamphun will declare itself the country's first "alcohol-freefuneral province" next month, when the project will be expanded to all districts, said Songkran one-million-strong Stop Drinking Network.

Land of partial smiles: Thailand's cheeriest place is Maha Sarakham Province in Isarn, according to a survey by the Mental Health Department.

Department Head ML Somchai Chakrabhand released the results of a 2005 survey, in which 3,340 people nationwide answered a series of questions to assess their overall happiness. Possible responses ranging from "not happy at all" to "very hap-

Men had the highest levels with 47% saying they were happy; only 25% of women could make the same claim. Somchai said women were less content because they had more on their minds, including work and fami-

The study found "the unem-

ployed" as the demographic group with the lowest level of personal happiness. Most Thais are "generally happy" the survey revealed.

Playground perils: A large metal ride toppled over and killed sixyear-old Chakarin Suriwong at a playground in the Territorial Defense Department's compound in Bangkok. The tragedy underlines research findings that most public playgrounds across the country are dangerous and not prop-

The spinning metal ride, known as a "global monkey bar", had not been safely anchored to the ground, a soldier at the compound admitted.

Dr Adisak Palitpholkarnphim, head of research at Ramathibodi Hospital in Bangkok, said 90% of playgrounds at schools and public places in Thailand are dangerous because the equipment does not match the development levels of children who use it and also because it is often not properly installed.

A study conducted in 2005, after the death of a child using a global monkey bar, found that more than 30,000 children across the country are injured by playground rides each year. Swings and slides were found to be the most dangerous.





## Jump starting Koh Samui

oh Samui and Koh Pha-ngan may soon enjoy a more stable power supply thanks to the installation of a new undersea cable stretching 24 kilometers from Khanom District on the Thai mainland.

Suwit Samarnsotiwong, Assistant Director of the local Provincial Electricity Authority, visited the islands in late October. After inspecting progress, he announced that power would be running through the cable before the coming high season.

The installation of the cable, Samui's third, required a serious feat of engineering to place the power lines under the seabed. A company, The Consortium of Italian-Thai Development PLC, signed the contract for the 899million-baht project in November 2005.

Suwit said the official deadline for completion was March next year, but added that senior members of the department had pressed for early completion because of the high demand on the island's power supply over Christmas and New Year.

Samui's electricity con-

sumption has been rising at a rate of 10% a year. The new cable will provide a much-needed boost to the power supply, with businesses and residents hoping it will also mean fewer of the power cuts and surges that damage electrical equipment.

The cable is being laid alongside the island's existing power lines. Environmental impact studies were carried out before and after the installation by a university team from Bangkok and the results show little damage to the marine life in the area.

In addition to the power cable, a fiber-optic cable was also installed, enhancing the island's communications capabilities.

#### The Family

ow old was the last meal you ate? Apologies, let me clarify that question. I don't mean "When was it prepared?" If it was Thai food, then chances are it was extremely fresh. Probably cooked in a couple of minutes within sight, sound and smell of you.


What I mean is "How old is the recipe of the last meal you ate?" Enjoying that pizza? Good. The combination of a flat bread with a cheese topping – it was traditionally peasant food – has been around since the mid-14<sup>th</sup> century or so.

How about the pan-seared loin of coatimundi with a balsamic and kumquat *jus* and an elderberry marmalade? Hmmm... dreamed up about five minutes ago by a facetious Features Editor, who still giggles at the phrase Pacific Rim. Can't help it; always had a childish sense of humor. It comes from never having grown up.

Come to think of it, that spurious dish may have some mileage, even though the coatimundi – the word is employed by Robert Jourdain in his 1997 book *Music, the Brain, and Ecstasy* an example of something meaningless to those who do not know what one is – actually doesn't live that close to the Pacific Rim (snigger).

One of the granddaddies of recipes must be the noodle.

In October last year, what was thought to be the oldest noodles yet discovered were found along the Yellow River in Qinghai, China. However, even these were found to be a couple of millennia fresher than some noxious McNoodles being peddled by a certain fast-food megacorp with a propensity for litigation...



## We are Family



How old is this sandwich? Pita bread, fried aubergine, hard-boiled eggs, potato and salad.

Ignore for a moment, if one can, cuisine of the Pacific Rim (stifled laugh), and focus instead on Mediterranean er... Rim – which is not funny at all – cuisine.

The recipes from this region have been around since God – or even Bill Deedes – was a boy. With certain variations – allowing for the growth and death of empires, the shift in the fortunes of countries and their boundaries, such food was eaten by the likes of Herodotus, Pericles, Alexander and others, depending upon your beliefs – and knowledge of history.

Israel, according to the Old Testament, is the land of milk and honey. We do not see a great deal of either at The Family, a restaurant immediately north of Chalong Circle on Chao Fa East Rd, but then, we don't really look for any.

Shicartzy Ovadia, from Eilat, on the Red Sea, bids us welcome with a hearty "shalom aleichem" to his restaurant. We, responding with the traditional "aleichem shalom", and take our seats.

The Family is not a new restaurant – around six years old now – nor is it a glitzy, whistles and bells self-proclaimed "best in the world" place.

The name, however, says all that is needed.

Families – us included – singles, couples and groups of friends are crowding the restaurant – which is opposite Chalong

Police Station – on a thundery Tuesday evening.

A DVD of a Pink Floyd concert is playing, accompanied by a slightly greater gig in the sky in the form of electric blue and pink lightning. All seems rather pleasant and not at all "Phuket". It's more like the relaxed, unpretentious George Town on Penang, particularly Chulia Street. Or downtown Eilat.

Israelis are sometimes described as being difficult to get to know, abrasive even, with question after question. Shicartzy, in his way, grills us over a couple of issues slightly more than he would a pita bread.

It's not aggressive questioning, nor is it to find fault or set a trap. Rather it's to gage opinions,

see where one stands. Israelis have, after all, been fighting for their families, nation and religions for centuries. Who wouldn't?

We don't take it personally and pass the test. He orders wine. We gulp it down.

The food he recommends is simple, healthy and damned tasty.

Pita served with falafel, humus, shwarma (marinated sliced meat), *shocshoca* (eggs in a fresh tomato sauce), tahini, chopped fried chicken are brought out.

A Yemeni omelet – more like a pastry than what we recognize as an omelet – is presented to us. Shicartzy says, "This is what would have been eaten in the Exodus from Egypt."

Dating that is a little tricky, but Moses was around then and best estimates put this flight at around 1400 BC.

History, undoubtedly, on a plate. Shicartzy senses our moment of pondering. He brews Turkish coffee for us, infused with heel, an aromatic that gives a slightly orangey smell to the small, dark cups.


A genial host, good food (he also supplies kosher products, as well as Western and Thai dishes), great company, splendid music – Shicartzy has a seemingly bottomless collection of blues albums – add up to a historic meal.

## Boxing: not just

eronika Lundemo admits she stepped up from being a Muay Thai student to an inthe-ring boxer purely by chance.

After kickboxing for years in her home country of Norway, one summer she decided to stay in shape by studying Muay Thai at a training camp in Thailand useful for a woman who works as a bartender and bouncer for a bar in Scandinavia.

After some time surfing the web, she came across Chalong Chi Muay Thai Boxing training camp in Chalong.

Veronika spent the summer of 2005 training at Chalong Chi. When she returned to Phuket this year, Chalong Chi offered her a contract to fight for the camp.

Veronika pounced on the opportunity, "I knew it was my last chance to do this, so I took it."

After saying goodbye to her parents, brother, sister-in-law and two nieces in her hometown of Trondheim, in central Norway, she was on her way back to Thai-

She's been fighting for the gym for four months now.

Muay Thai has a reputation for brutality, its fighters using combinations of kicks, knee strikes, clinches, punches and elbows to defeat their opponents.

For Veronika, it's this aspect of the martial art that appeals to her; in the form of kickboxing she learned in Norway, she never used her elbows or knees.

"There are more elements to it," Veronika says. "There's more contact, it's more intense and there's just more to it."

Being a Muay Thai boxer also requires intense training, which focuses not only on learning combinations and strikes, but also on overall conditioning. Veronika trains twice a day, from 6 am to 9 am and again from 4 pm to 7 pm, five days a week.

Her typical training schedule includes running, skipping, shadow boxing and weight train-

"It's a lot like a job," says the 34-year-old, but she adds that the training doesn't get her down. In fact, she says, that is what

Veronika won her bout at the Queen's Cup tournament in Bangkok in August and is in training for her fight at the King's Cup next month. Here Veronika tells what drives her on to compete in a sport most men would be happy to avoid.

keeps her going - each time pushing herself further than be-

"The fights are just goals along the way. Training is what makes or breaks the fighter," she

Despite the intense preparation, Veronika admits she gets nervous before fights, sometimes even a week before.

To prepare for a fight she goes over different combinations in her head, thinking through the fight ahead of her. But once she's in the ring her head goes clear. She doesn't have to think, she knows what she has to do.

Currently Veronika is preparing to fight in the King's Cup at the famed Lumpini Stadium in Bangkok on December 5.

Veronika proved her skills there last August at the Queen's Cup in Bangkok – one of the biggest Muay Thai tournaments in Thailand.

Veronika not only won her fight, but she won it against a more experienced opponent on points – not by knocking out her opponent as most foreign Muay Thai fighters do.

"It was a really good feeling, like a climax, when you

achieve what you want," Veron-

So what does a female Muay Thai boxer do in her very limited free time? Veronika reads or listens to music. No surprise that heavy metal music is a favorite, but she listens to a little of everything. "I also spend time at the beach or go to a local spa," she adds.

What happens when Veronika gets angry? Well, girls, you'll feel better knowing that she does what most of us do – she screams and sometimes even cries.

Asked if she has any advice for those of the fairer sex who are interested in learning a few Muay Thai moves, she says, "Go for it. If you want to do it and you like it, just go for it."


'It was a really good feeling, like a climax, when you achieve what you want': Veronika Lundemo.



he Ferrari 612 is not to everyone's taste, if you can say that about a Ferrari, but it is one of the more tasteful models in the cur-

rent line-up. It is, perhaps, predominantly aimed at the more mature enthusiast than the outand-out racer in us all.

Styled by Pininfarina, the Turin-based design house and long-time collaborator of the Ferrari marque, the 612 is the first all-aluminum V12 Ferrari. It is also more than a 2+2 tourer; it is a genuine two-door, four seater.

Grand Tourers are a Ferrari tradition. Ferrari built its first 2+2 12-cylinder model in 1948. Subsequent Ferrari Grand Tourers followed, including famous models such as the 250 GT in 1960, the 330 GT in 1964 and, probably the best of all, the 365 GT in 1967.

The predecessor of the 612 Scaglietti was the 456M, which although good and offering stunning performance, was never going to be a classic.

Named in honor of the Modena stylist and coach builder Sergio Scaglietti, who excelled in sculpting aluminum and was responsible for the bodies of some of the most beautiful Ferraris of the 1950s and '60s, the 612 represents everything that is exceptional about Ferrari GTs.

The beautifully engineered V12 displaces 5,748cc and produces a staggering 540bhp (397 kW) at 7,250rpm, an engine speed that produces a delightful lowpitched growl rising to a scream as the revs increase.

Maximum torque, as befits a Grand Tourer, is a stump-pulling 588Nm. The power output, in-



cidentally, is almost 100bhp up on the 456M.

While these figures mean that the car will move around effortlessly at low revs, the fun is to be had by operating the steering wheel-mounted paddles and changing down one or even two ratios for immediate acceleration.

Performance, needless to say, is stunning: 0-100 km/h is down to just 4.2 seconds. Maximum speed is listed as 320kmh, though exactly where you would reach this locally has to be an is-

The aluminum technology used in the space frame chassis and bodywork, which proved such a success in the V8 360 Modena, results in a huge increase in overall bodywork efficiency, or the weight-rigidity ratio.

The light but stiff aluminum construction offers other benefits in terms of performance, comfort and safety. Its light weight contributes to acceleration, braking, handling and the driving dynamics of the car.

The layout of the drive train, with the engine mounted behind the front axle and driving the rear wheels, ensures a near-perfect weight distribution of 46% at the front and 54% at the rear, an impressive achievement in any front-engined four-seater.

Getting in and out of twodoor vehicles can often be tax-

ing, but a clever hinge in the front seats means rear seat passengers have no problem accessing their

For the driver, a simple switch lowers the front seat and its headrest, and tilts the steering wheel. The seats are finished in

sumptuous leather, with three memories incorporated into the electrically-operated driver's seat that re-adjusts the seat and exterior mirrors.

Legroom is generous, front and rear, and comfortably exceeds that of the 456M.

Headroom is also improved, while the dashboard is inevitably classic Ferrari: simple but effec-

Driving the 612 is exquisite: the lovely V12 responds instantly and the brakes are fantastic.

If there is a problem, it is to remember that it is not an automatic; when you come to a stop at lights or in traffic, you have to apply the brakes, otherwise it rolls backwards. And, trust me, you feel extremely stupid in a multi-million-baht GT car doing

The 612 is a superb motorcar with all the pedigree of Ferrari's previous GTs and one that deserves its own place in the marque's history chapters. Absolutely outstanding.

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

The use of masks dates back thousands of years and have been used since for both ceremonial and practical purposes. Historians believe the 5,000-year-old Mask of Warka is the oldest surviving mask.



t was time to reward my soul by visiting the beautiful Tew Son Spa, located amid the lush greenery of the Katathani Resort & Spa and with delightful sea views.

Tew Son Spa, which opened in 2003 and is managed by Asian Wind, is in the capable hands of Rawiwan "Jiew" Katesaro.

A true professional – she has more than seven years' experience in the business – she is also warm-hearted, welcoming me with a sincere smile.

K. Jiew tells me that the popular spa has 14 therapists, catering to as many as 50 customers a day during the high season. Each therapist works hard, dedicated, as they are to their calling.

They have nine treatment rooms - three double and six single rooms – and separate steam rooms for men and women.

Most of the rooms boast both an indoor and outdoor shower. Each room is decorated with a different motif and some rooms have a window with a panoramic sea view. K. Jiew took me around to see the waterfall room and the water-spring room.

Most of the customers here are hotel guests, but the Tew Son

customers. Mnay materials used here – such as oils, scrubs, body lotions and masks – are supplied by Lemongrass House at Surin Beach, but the facial products used are by Lydia Jordane of Aus-

The spa menu here includes massages, facials, body treatments, signature treatments, luxury packages and "special treats". Each menu has many choices to match your body's wants and needs.

Another outstanding feature of Tew Son Spa is the rooftop Jacuzzi, which is booked almost every evening because it has rally, most of the customers who book the Jacuzzi are couples planning a private, romantic evening.

Each visit begins with a consultation with a therapist to help choose the best treatment for the customer's wants and needs.

K. Jiew suggested I try the 1,990-baht Casuarina Leaf Enzyme Wrap, which is one of the signature treatments here.

I feel a little wary at the mention of this treatment because it is my understanding the casuarina leaf could make me itch. Time, however, to find out.

My therapist Tim Injom, who has more than six years' experience in spas, will provide the signature "Nature's Own" treatment (1,820 baht). The two treatments together will take about two hours.

In the treatment room are the relaxing sounds of a waterfall and the lapping waves. The room may not be large, but it is cozy and decorated pleasantly in a Northern Thai style with soothing earth tones. The room has an outdoor shower, fashioned from bamboo, and under a shady casurina tree. It's as natural as you can get.

K. Tim starts me off with a mask and wrapped me in a warm blanket for 15 minutes. This treatment is divine, nurturing. A body wrap uses the nourishing properties of crushed casuarina pine needles and bergamot oil. A wonderful bergamot and lavender massage completes this memorable experience. After this comes a scrub, then I step into the outdoor shower. I return for a lotion massage.

After this treatment, my skin feels beyond soft and smooth. During the wrap, I felt hours in advance to book.

no itching at all. I like the lotion massage; it's different because usually lotion is just spread over the body without being massaged deep into skin.

I enjoy the second treatment as well - the Nature's Own facial. It uses four Thai herbs or plants extracts: a ka-min scrub, a cucumber toner, honey oil, and white mud before my face is covered with fresh cucumber.

After another hour or so, the facial is done. I know that most of the ingredients are readily available here, and that I could do it to myself if I really wanted, but... Well, it's just so much nicer for someone to take the time to do it for me.

K. Tim finished by applying eye gel, moisturizer cream and lip moisturizer to me, before a refreshing head and foot massage to wake me up. Before I head back home they serve me a cool herbal drink.

The costs of the spa treatment packages here range from 1,690 to 6,320 baht.

## Eclipsed by the 21st century



istory has touched Phan Tiet, but lightly. Ho Chi Minh taught briefly at the riverside school here, but as yet no enterprising former pupil has thought to market tours following the footsteps of Vietnam's charismatic liberator.

In fact, it took an eclipse of the sun in October 1995 to put what is now one of the country's fastest growing destinations on the map.

The headland of Mui Ne was the optimum viewing point, and thousands flocked here for that most Kodak of moments when the currant bun ducked behind the cosmic curtain for a while.

When the lights came back on, it didn't take long for the entrepreneurs among the rubberneckers to put two and two together.

Hmmm... groovy beach, picturesque fishing port, nobody else here, what are we waiting

The great thing about Phan Tiet is that despite the arrival in the interim of more than a few boutique hotels, a Nick Faldo-designed par-72, 18-holer, and cafés selling something rather more than pho (noodles), it's still pretty much off the beaten track.

Even though it now hosts an annual festival celebrating the province's culture and folk traditions, it's more of a time for the locals to kick up their heels rather than an international, corporatebranded event.

Halfway between Ho Chi Minh City and Nha Trang, Phan Tiet happens to be the capital of Bin Thuan province, though you'd hardly know it.

A morning's cyclo tour can take in the armada of fishing craft moored along the Ca Ty River,







### The Wise Woman of Baltimore

nne Tyler has written 17 novels set in Baltimore, the best known being *The Accidental Tourist* and *Breathing Lessons*, which won the 1988 Pulitzer Prize.

In *Digging to America* (Alfred A. Knopf, New York, 2006, 277pp), she is at the top of her form. The story opens on the night of August 15, 1997, at a nearly deserted Baltimore airport.

girl named Jin-Ho. After a tumultuous welcome full of flashbulbs and video cameras, another Korean orphan arrives and "three people no one had noticed before approached in single file: a youngish couple, foreign-looking, olive-skinned and attractive, followed by a slim older woman with a chignon of sleek black hair knotted low on the nape of her neck".

These are the Yazdans, originally from Iran, who have come to pick up their own orphan from Korea. The two families instantly become friends.



Her son Sami has refused to speak Farsi from the age of four. A real estate agent, he speaks English with a pure Baltimore accent.

Instead of the blondes he'd dated all through high school, Sami marries Ziba Hakimi whom he meets in college. Ziba is part of a large, loud, rich clan based in Washington who happily descend on Baltimore every Arrival Day for an elaborate Iranian feast orchestrated by Maryam.

While Bitsy Donaldson insists on keeping Jin-Ho's birth name, retaining her Korean bowl haircut and dressing her in traditional costume, Sukki Yazdan becomes Susan and wears blue jeans.

Not that the Yazdans are completely enamored by Ameri-



ca. And things worsen after September 11.

The pivotal character is Maryam who holds herself aloof from both Americans and Iranians. Her circle of three women friends are Greek, Turkish and French. Dave, Bitsy's father, intrudes on Maryam's life after his wife dies of cancer. They date, become lovers and Dave proposes marriage. Maryam accepts

and the two families indulge in an orgy of champagne. The next day Maryam changes her mind.

"He is so American," Maryam complains to Ziba. "He takes up so much space. He seems to be unable to let a room stay as it is, always he has to alter it, to turn on the fan or raise the thermostat or play a record or open the curtains. He has cluttered my life with cell phones and answering machines and a fancy-shamcy teapot that makes my tea taste like metal...Americans are all larger than life. You think that if you keep company with them you will be larger too, but then you see that

they're making you shrink: they're expanding and edging you out."

When the next Arrival Day comes, Jin-Ho and Susan are in kindergarten and big enough to dislike each other. Will Maryam attend? Will she return to the embrace of the Americans?

The magic of Anne Tyler is that she makes you care deeply whether she does or not.

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### Binding foreign teachers in red tape achieves nothing

Prime Minister Surayud Chulanont on November 3 delivered a policy statement of what his interim government hopes to accomplish within one year.

There is little to argue in the key points of his political policy agenda, which highlights, among other noble objectives, political reform, promotion of press freedom and the strengthening of independent bodies to restore a functioning mechanism of checks and balances to combat Thai society's most intractable foe: corruption.

On at least one policy objective, however, the junta's actions appear to run counter to its policy objectives. In promising to work toward decentralization of power to local administrative bodies, a legacy of the now-abrogated 1997 Constitution, one would expect a diminished role for the Ministry of Education (MoE) and an increased role in educational affairs at the local level.

This has not happened.

The MoE, which eats up more of the government's annual budget than any other ministry, recently revealed the extent to which it intends to maintain its central role by issuing a set of strict new measures, applicable to every school in the country, that will make it more difficult than ever for schools to find foreign teaching staff [see News pages].

The measures, which aim to reduce the number of less-savory foreigners having access to children, include lengthy background checks of all new foreign staff at schools, as well as a requirement that all foreign teachers at Thai schools have, as a minimum, a bachelor's degree.

It is ironic that the bachelor's degree requirement comes at a time when the the Constitution Drafting Assembly is now debating doing away this very same requirement for Thai MPs.

It is also bewildering why the MoE reasons that a person who holds a degree poses less threat to society than one who does not. Under the new rules, Hannibal Lecter would still find work in Thailand, but a well-intentioned community-college graduate would not.

Thailand's Immigration Department, its Foreign Ministry and other government branches already have numerous tools at their disposal to check backgrounds of those entering the country, and schools themselves have every reason to vet teachers thoroughly.

When will the many arms of Thai bureaucracy ever learn that vigilance, reason and effective communication – not red tape – are the keys to keeping bad foreigners out and allowing the vast majority of law-abiding ones to do their jobs and help their adoptive society?

## Checks and balances hamper education

agree with the spirit of the regulation, but I want to ask for fairness for my school, which is just one of the 51 schools represented at the recent meeting held in Phuket on this is-

I wish someone would explain to us why our two work permit applications were held up, because they were submitted for approval before the new regulations were announced.

I also think this order is unfair to many foreign teachers working in Thailand, who are forced to suffer because of the actions of one person in a case that had nothing to do with them.

However, we accept and are ready to comply with this rule; I think every other school in the province can as well.

Phuket is a small province with just three districts, so I don't think it should be too much of a problem for the schools to work together with the government to check out the history of foreign teachers they plan to employ, as long as we know the requirements in advance.

But now QSI Phuket has a staffing problem, because the work permit applications that were held up. It is important to realize that QSI already has a very strict selection process, administered through its central office in the USA. It is responsible

N ew regulations requiring extensive background checks on all foreign teachers working in the province [see News pages] has hit some schools harder than oth-

QSI International School of Phuket, a non-profit international school, recently lost two potential staff when the province held up two work permit applications - both submitted before the new regulation was announced.

Here, QSI Phuket teacher Ruangnapa "Khru Noi" Hirunroj explains how Ministry of Education officials should better consider the needs of teachers and students when issuing edicts that effect their lives.



for checking that all teachers sent out to any of the 32 QSI schools around the world are persons of high moral standards, because we realize that they have to serve as role models for our students.

By passing our own strict standards, the teachers also comply with all hiring policies of the Thai government for foreign teachers. Our system works, too.

About eight years ago, QSI Phuket had one teacher who applied using fake academic credentials and we immediately threw out his application and denied him a job. QSI Phuket is not a school that hires someone just because his native language happens to be English. Screening applicants' credentials has always been important here. It has to be, because our reputation depends on it.

I would like the people who issued this regulation to know what an additional hardship it places on schools that already face formidable obstacles in finding qualified, foreign staff. It is not fair to the students, either.

When I was student, I loved my teachers and always worried about them if they were absent. I think all students think like this, because they have close relationships with their teachers. But it seems that the people who put these regulations in place don't understand the importance of student-teacher relationships.

We were all students at one time, so I would like to ask those in position of power to remember this important point. Now we lack foreign teaching staff. It was already difficult enough for us before, as many of our teachers arrive here on tourist visas and we have to cover the expense of their trips abroad to get the nonimmigrant visa they need to apply for a work permit.

Because of this current problem, QSI was unable to apply for the non-immigrant visas for the two teachers we intended to hire. They have since gone back to the US and we are shortstaffed as a result.

The people who set such regulations need a deeper understanding of the results of their actions on schools, teachers and students. They should understand just how much time out of the classroom results, and what a loss it is for the students.

Maybe one of them could visit one day, look into the eyes of our students, and apologize to them for the fact that the library and physical education positions haven't been filled yet.

It's a big loss to the students, because they need to study with native English speakers.

The remaining teachers, including the Thai staff, suffer from this too. Now that QSI doesn't have a physical education teacher, I must add classes in this subject to my already-full course load as a music teacher.

QSI observes every public holiday and all important cultural occasions, as instructed by the Ministry of Education.

Every morning at 8 am you can see our students – including children of foreigners – proudly singing the Thai national anthem and paying their respects to the three things Thais hold most dear: Nation, Religion and our King, the same as every other school in Thailand.

QSI Phuket is a small school, with just 12 foreign teachers and six Thais, so now we are short of a physical education teacher and librarian, both jobs that should be held by foreign teachers. We went through a good deal and waited a long time for replacement staff to fill these positions, but then it fell through because of this regula-

I want the people responsible to sympathize with international schools, which need to hire a lot of foreign teachers to educate our students. We don't want just anybody who can speak English; we only want the best teachers for our students.

Now we are worried because we need replacement teachers quickly, but that is impossible under the current rules.

So I ask those responsible to please take into better consideration the needs of the students and the feelings of foreigners who work as teachers here.

At the small shrine atop Patong Hill, I notice that they sometimes set up a screen to show a movie. It seems like a strange place to show a movie to me, especially given the lack of parking and general road chaos in that area.

Someone told me these movies were not, in fact, for public viewing but Maha Prom shrine in Bangkok, wood-

Is that true? If so, how and when do they screen them? What type of movies do they usually show? How common is this practice? Is it local to Phuket? Is it ok to stop and watch "with the spirits"? Can I drink beer there if I do?

Thai people love to make vows, take an oath or in other ways make wishes or prayers for something.

When their wish is fulfilled they must repay according to their promise or kaebon to the spirits, the shrine or to the Buddha, although this practice is certainly not a part of Buddhism.

They tend to ask for happiness, to recover something that is lost, to have a child,

for success, to pass an exam, to win a lottery and so on.

One could say they tend to ask for almost anything under the sun and they really never stop asking.

If a spirit could speak, he or she might say, "For God's sake, I've had enough of your requests."

However, this practice has existed for a long, long time and in fact seems to grow continuously.

Our belief is that one cannot forget to *kaebon* if the wish comes true. be even decide to grant you a wish.

Otherwise, if the promise has not been fulfilled, the spirit will haunt your mind and cause bad karma.

There are various common ways to kaebon, which often depend upon which shrine and where you go to make a wish or a vow.

For example at the famous Tao

en elephants, seven colored garlands and sponsoring a Thai classical dance are often offered at the

This varies from one region to the next. A person could even make a vow to run a marathon if his wish is fulfilled.

In the South, a traditional leekay show or shadow puppet show was commonly offered to the spirits. In modern times, this has often become the playing of a movie.

In the case of a movie, one could vow to have an English, Thai, Chinese or even an Indian movie.

If you happen to pass by when the show is going on, you can certainly stop to watch, even though it is not really intended for public viewing – although I would really caution you about the dangerous traffic

situation at the Patong Hill shrine.

It may also be possible that the Chinese shrine on top of Patong Hill is celebrating its yearly homage to the spirits with movies.

Of course you can drink whatever you want, but it would be a good idea to fill a little cup and offer some to the spirit at the shrine as well.

## THE MOODY BLUES

here is a saying that goes, "Life is a roller-coaster". This saying refers to how life is comprised; it is a series of perpetual "ups and downs", with high points and low points.

There are times when you feel as happy as if you'd won a million baht – and then there are the days when you feel so frazzled and fed up you just want to shut your door on the world and go to sleep for a week.

Everybody has those moments, although the frequency of good moments and bad moments varies depending on the person. Some fortunate people naturally have more happy times than bad times, usually due to the circumstances they were born into, such as the financial state of their family or the emotional state of their parents

At the other end of the spectrum, some people just seem to suffer from more bad luck, usually because they have not had a good start in life.

You would think the relationship between the circumstances of your life and your mood would be as clear as black and white.

But nowadays a new trend is emerging; many people in to-day's world, despite having enough money, a supportive family and fun friends, just aren't having as many high points as you might expect. In fact, some people's moods plummet and remain low for a protracted period of time.

This results in failure to live a healthy, functional life. The medical term for this? Depression.

The symptoms of depression are as follows: not enjoying activities you previously loved, withdrawing from family and friends, persistent feelings of having failed, loss of purpose in life and troubles with eating and sleeping.

This disorder, only recently recognized as a actual illness, used to be referred to as "mal-

It's a disease that can afflict anyone, regardless of background.

aise" or "melancholy", which gave people the unfortunate impression that depression was just a temporary emotional state, perhaps reflecting a flaw in the affected person's character.

In today's world, much to the relief of depression victims, doctors now know that it is a disease of the brain caused by the imbalance of a "happy" chemical in the brain called serotonin.

Serotonin promotes a stable mood and helps us eat and sleep normally. When something inhibits serotonin's uptake in the brain, we get depressed. This can go on for a long period of time and can even be fatal if it's not treated.

Unlike other severe mental disorders, one of the major problems with depression is that it's a subtle illness so it can often go undiagnosed. You might not know someone has it, even if they're your best friend or a family member.

Even if you do get suspicious, you might just attribute their behavior to something like stress

or hormones, two problems we teens suffer from a great deal.

In the turbulent teenage years it can be difficult to separate the melodrama from the real drama of a mental disorder, but the reality is that depression is one of the most common illnesses among teenagers.

It can be very debilitating, especially as these adolescent years are when we lay the foundations for our futures.

If a teenager falls prey to depression – the illness which Winston Churchill famously called "the black dog" – they lose interest in friends, school and family. Depression can even lead to further problems such as drug and alcohol abuse or eating disorders

If this happens the best thing is to get medical help, even though there might be embarrassment about the "stigma" surrounding depression and the popping of anti-depressant pills.

Fortunately, a revolution in the anti-depressant industry has resulted in a whole new range of Youth 'n

medications with few side effects and proven results.

Sometimes depression can continue for a long, lonely period of time, as it is hard for family and friends to relate to the emotions involved because they have never experienced them.

People with depression can feel isolated, lost, helpless, out of control, even suicidal. The important thing to remember is that help is always out there in the form of psychiatrists, medication and the support system of family.

Really, the stigma about this disease should not exist. The simple truth is that teens, and indeed anyone who contracts depression, aren't irrevocably reduced to jibbering wrecks in straitjackets. They are normal people just like you, with a house, pets, friends and hobbies.

The only difference is that every day they must battle with

a malignant illness that attempts to rob them of happiness and pleasure. It is a cancer of the emotions, and just like cancer it can be treated.

With a mild bout of depression, the afflicted teen's typical "healthy" behavior of wanting to stay in bed, moaning, complaining and shouting becomes much more pronounced – so much so that they might refuse to get out of bed, stop eating properly and just want to sleep all day.

It's tough, but it's not the end of the world.

No matter how frustrating it is to be the friend or family member of a teenager with depression, don't give up on them.

Their behavior is not that of a selfish stubborn person. Rather, it is symptomatic of someone who has been temporarily taken over by an illness that hijacks the brain and can cause them to say things they don't mean or take actions they would never consider while in a normal frame of mind.

What you must never forget is they are still the loving, good person they were before the disease struck, and that with a little support that true kernel of their personality can resurface and take back control of their emotions.

Depression may be a crippling disorder, but it is just a disorder and it can be effectively treated with support and some helpful "happiness boosting" antidepressants. All the black dog needs is a collar and he can be banished to the dog house for good.





### DO definitely does it

eople I've never met be fore are stopping me and asking about DO (pro nounced "dee-oh"), the new wireless broadband service from the Communications Authority of Thailand (CAT).

People all over the island are excited, for a change – and well they should be. DO isn't perfect, but it's a giant step forward for long-suffering Phuket Internet users.

For those of you who have not kept up to date, CAT has installed DO receivers on its towers all over Phuket, and over much of Thailand.

Phuket was chosen for the pilot program because of its rather compact size and its likely demand for fast, relatively cheap, reliable Internet access.

The technology is called C D M A 2 0 0 0 1xEV-DO Rev A.

KHUN WOODY'S COMPUTER

How good is it? Consider this. In the US, Sprint announced last month that it was just starting to roll out its DO Rev A network, a move that "will give the nation's third-largest wireless carrier the fastest wide area network" in the US.

Sprint will have DO in 21 US cities by the end of the year. We have it here. In Phuket. Now.

At this point, you have just one choice for DO: you must buy a Sierra Wireless 580 "air card" from CAT. It's a PCMCIA card and it will only fit into a PCMCIA (also called a "PC-Card") slot—the long, thin slot that's common on laptops but unusual on desktops.

The card costs about 16,000 baht and as I write this CAT still has some available. If you buy the card now, DO service is free for the rest of the year. After Janu-

eople I've never met be ary 1, it costs 1,290 baht per fore are stopping me and month.

CAT doesn't make any speed claims, but i was impressed by my test results. The only place I couldn't get a signal was at Nai Harn Beach. I didn't test everywhere on the island, of course.

Some people wait months to get ADSL lines. The DO card installs in minutes, no land line necessary, and it should work in all the major population centers – and many "upcountry" areas – throughout Thailand. No extra charge. No hassle.

In my previous articles, I said you had to go to one of the CAT offices to get the card.

I mistakenly said there were three in Phuket: in fact, there are only two, one on Phang Nga Rd in Phuket City and another in

Aroonsom Plaza in Patong.

S e v e r a l people have told me that they've

seen DO cards offered elsewhere in Phuket.

Don't be surprised if mobile phone companies get into the act. As long as you're buying a Sierra Wireless 580 card with DO service from CAT, you've got the right beast.

I have received at least 100 emails about DO. Here's a sampling from them:

You may find this amusing. I read your article on DO so I had my Thai staff call two different CAT offices.

It took three days of calling before anyone could be found who had heard about DO.

Finally, on the third day, we were able to get a quote: 15,450 baht for the card and 1,290 baht per month.

When my staff asked if it works on a specific Soi in Ka-

mala she was told to bring the computer to Patong and they would test it to be sure it works in Kamala.

DO is new to CAT, so don't be too surprised if it takes a while to find somebody who knows about it. But if you say "Dee-Oh" (or maybe "Computer Cee-Dee-Em-Aaa"), you will get hooked up with the right people.

Once you find the right people, you'll be amazed at how well they know the product. At least Lam

CAT's working with worldclass "3G" third-generation mobile phone technology, and doing a bang-up job with it.

I am a little bit concerned about the location of our house. It is at a base of a large hill, not far from Chalong Circle. I don't want to spend this kind of money just to find out that it won't work. What do you think?

MC

The only way to find out for sure is to go down to CAT, order the card and wait for them to install it.

They'll come to your house or office and make sure you can get a signal. If it doesn't work, you don't owe anything.

Your biggest problem right now may be getting in line quickly enough.

If the volume of interest I've seen is any indication, CAT has a sure-fire winner on their hands, and it may take a while to get out to your place.

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### Obituary: John Seebach

A sad loss to Phuket's computer community

n October 11, the computer community in Phuket was saddened by the loss of one of its most prominent members when John E Seebach succumbed to heart failure after swimming with his wife, Autcharawan "Gay" Pratumwan.

John is survived by his mother, Teresa, older brother Richard and sister Carol, as well as his wife.

John was born in New Jersey on November 18, 1958, and he grew up in upstate New York, in a small town called Horseheads. In 1982, John graduated from the State University of New York (SUNY), majoring in Mechanical Engineering.

In 1987 he was awarded a second degree, an Associate of Arts degree in Accounting from Texas A&M University. He was also a certified Microsoft Network Engineer.

After graduating from SUNY, John worked in the oil business, with Ingersol Rand as an R&D Engineer, SEPCO Industries as an Applications Engineer, and ARAMCO as a Project Manager on two offshore rigs.

In 1990 he joined California Pacific Medical Services as a Project Manager, where he implemented one of the first wide area network physician-support systems in Northern California.

John moved to southern Thailand in 1995, working as MIS Director for the International Division of Phillips Seafood Company. He met Gay while working for Phillips Seafood. They married on August 9, 2002.

In 1999, John and Gay moved to Singapore and founded Lavabread Co Ltd, which developed one of the first Internet-based e-commerce systems. They sold the company in 2001 to Firststep.com, an American Internet company.

In 2001, John and Gay moved to Phuket, founding Island Technology Co Ltd, one of the most active computer companies on the island. In four years the company grew from two employees with 1.2 million baht annual revenue to 31 employees with revenues in excess of 30 million baht. John designed and installed the first commercial broadband network in southern Thailand.

Recently, John and Gay devoted increasing amounts of their time and effort on Luna Phuket, their luxury garden villa development just outside Laguna Resort and the Sheraton and Banyan Tree hotels.

John was a member of the Rotary Club of Patong Beach and on the board of the International Business Association of Phuket. He took part in many early rounds of the Phuket Information City project.

He had a reputation as a results-oriented hard worker, with a big heart and a gift for wisecracking banter. He was renowned for his tales of small-town upstate New York and for his oft-repeated claim that, "Gay saved my life."

We'll miss you, John.

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

he Club Andaman Group (CAG) is moving ahead with its Andaman Bazaar commercial property development on Thaweewong Rd, Patong, with the complex's central attraction, the ThruSea entertainment venue, due to open by the end of this month.

ThruSea, a 980-squaremeter shopping promenade, is being built behind Andaman Bazaar, which stretches from Haad Patong Rd to Saxophone restaurant.

ThruSea is about 60% complete and expected to cost a total of 7 million baht.

Nol Sawangjang, Asset Management Manger of Club Andaman Beach Resort, explained that ThruSea will have capacity for more than 300 guests, with 75% of its floor area outdoors.

"The modern-design restaurant will be divided into two sections: upstairs will be an open-air terrace where guests can enjoy cocktails while enjoying the view of Patong Beach; downstairs will

be a dance floor with the latest sound-and-lighting system," he said.

"CAG management has

concentrated on designing Thru-Sea to be a big luxury entertainment venue in outstanding modern style.

"It will be similar to The Port, another entertainment venue in Patong, or Rock City, which is part of Andaman Bazaar, but ThruSea will serve everything at 'normal' prices," Nol added.

Andaman Bazaar is CAG's first venture into the Patong commercial property market. Of its 46 units, each with 48sqm of interior space, 39 units are already being rented at 60,000 baht a month. A deposit of six months'

rent – 360,000 baht – is required to take up occupancy.

CAG was formed to create an asset management company bringing together resources of the 253-room, four-star Club Andaman Beach Resort and the 93-room Andaman Beach Suites Hotel. The company began construction of Andaman Bazaar in July 2005.

CAG General Manager Adison Sitthiwong explained that the move adds to the Club Andaman Beach Resort's and the Andaman Beach Suites Hotel's combined competitiveness.





Left: Two parts of the project are complete and operating. Above: General Manager Adison Sitthiwong.

"Many hotel businesses in Patong are expanding. Many are managed by foreigners and international-chain businesses, so we must improve our hotels to remain competitive," he said.

Adisorn explained that moves introduced to improve Club Andaman Beach Resort include ISO 9001:2000 certification and the use of key performance indicators to improve the hotel's effectiveness. "Although these systems are not new for hotels belonging to foreigners or run by international-chain management, for Thai people they are new management tools that can help us to improve our quality of service," he said.

n the world of financial planning, financial institutions usually have their bases in different countries. As no single investment house has the total solution to client needs, it is necessary to use an investment platform to simplify matters. For example, finding the best solution for any client may require the use of financial products from anything from three to eight different financial institutions.

However, this would lead to confusion because of a number of factors. Administration itself would become tedious, extremely time consuming and in the event of the death of a client it would lead to a legal nightmare of having clients' beneficiaries trying to tie up multi-jurisdictional estates, all requiring probate to be granted in a number of countries.

In addition, each financial institution used by an investor requires extensive documentation on source of wealth, proof of residential address and so on. The alternative would be to rely on one financial institution to provide services for the client, but that in turn would limit the client to both investment opportunities and types of investment.

No investment house in the world can expect to offer all possible types of investment choices and to be the best choice for every type of investment.

Although many banks and other asset managers offer to manage money, they usually do so on the basis of offering three different types of portfolios: secure, balanced and aggressive.

What they are basically packaging are three different choices. The secure approach usually means a portfolio consisting of bonds and some cash. The balanced approach consists of bonds, cash and equities. The

aggressive fund usually consists of equities (stock market) with perhaps some recourse to a small inclusion of bonds and cash.

Rather than "one size fits all" this simply leads to "three sizes fits all". It simplifies matters for the financial institution, but can hardly be described as "personal financial planning".

The solution to all these problems is actually quite simple – use an investment platform. This allows investors to go through the anti-money-laundering, source of wealth process only once – regardless of how many financial institutions the capital is actually invested in.

It also gives the investor much greater control over the allocation of assets in the investment portfolio.

For example many people are wary of exposure to risk in stock markets, but do not want their money to be invested in

The insurance industry has moved in to fill this gap in the market by offering "investment platforms" whereby the client and an adviser make the investment decisions.

This has come about simply because all the major investment houses, including the world's largest banks, want to offer their products via insurance

companies. To them, insurance companies are a huge source of new business that takes no effort to access, and they do not need to go through the anti-money-laundering requirements as the insurance company has already attended to them.

For banks and asset managers, it is simply a matter of their dealing department conducting instant business with the dealing department of an insurance company. It is professionals dealing with professionals. As a result, normal charging structures are heavily discounted as these are electronic transactions.

A recent addition to the range of insurance companies used by Global Portfolios is Scot-

tish Life International, part of the Royal London Group. Formed in 1861, today it is the largest mutual insurance company in Europe. A mutual insurance company is owned 100% by the policy holders; there are no outside shareholders.



### Chinese make clean sweep of Phuket beach volley finals

KARON: The final of the Swatch FIVB volleyball tournament on November 5 – the last event of the 2006 world tour - was an all-Chinese affair, pitting Xue Chen and Zhang Xi against compatriots Tian Jia and Wang Jie.

Xue and Zhang went on to win in the third all-Chinese final of this season's FIVB tour. American gold medalists Misty May-Treanor and Kerri Walsh took third place.

Seeded third in the 32-team main draw, Xue and Zhang scored a 21-18, 21-15 victory in 48 minutes. The winners will split the US\$32,000 (1.2-million-baht) winners' prize while their Chinese rivals split US\$22,000 for second place.

"This is a great way to end our FIVB season," said 17-yearold Xue, who teamed with Zhang to win the top spot at the May tourney in China, where they defeated Tian and Wang for the Shanghai crown.

'Tian Jia and Wang Jie had defeated us seven times straight since Shanghai, so we are glad to break their streak against us," said 21-year-old Zhang, who was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Phuket tourney.

"Since they are a very good team, we have to play a perfect match to defeat them. We did that today.

For Xue, the final also completed the most successful season ever for a player her age in international women's beach volleyball. In addition to becoming

the youngest player to win FIVB titles, she and Zhang finished third on the points standings (5,120) with US\$195,200 (7.8 million baht) in winnings, four medals and a 55-23 match mark for 13 tournaments.


Tian and Wang, who also defeated Xue and Zhang in September to win gold in Warsaw, were competing in their ninth Swatch "final four" this season. Tian and Wang placed second to Brazil's Juliana Felisberta Silva and Larissa Franca – 7,060 points to 5,940 – with \$238,600 in earnings, eight medals and a 60-20 match record.

The Phuket Thailand Open bronze medal was claimed by top-seeded May-Treanor and Walsh as the Americans beat fourth-seeded Nila Ann Hakedal and Ingrid Torlen of Norway for the second time in three days, with a 21-15, 21-13 win in 32 minutes.

May-Treanor and Walsh split US\$16,000 for third place, with the Norwegians sharing US\$12,000.

The Americans ended the FIVB season fourth overall, with US\$201,400 in winnings.

## Red Cross gets a new home

he new Phuket Provincial Red Cross office being built on Rattanakosin 200 Pi Rd is 40% complete and is expected to be finished by April next year, two months ahead of the original completion date.

The 18.62-million-baht project, funded by the Thai Red Cross Society, will comprise a two-story Sino-Portuguese-style building, a one-story storage building and necessary infrastructure on the 6.2-rai plot.

Construction of the buildings began in July this year.

"The new Red Cross buildings are being built to replace the existing office, which is located at the Governor's house on Narisorn Rd," said Rapeepat Na Nakorn, Chief of the Governor's Office.

"The existing office has been used for 93 years and is in constant need of repair, and the office doesn't have enough space to support the growth of the Red Cross."

The main building will have an interior space of 850 square meters, with two offices, a reception area and a meeting room with capacity of 50 people on the ground floor. The second floor will have additional office space.

A budget of 10 million baht has been set for the main building, and 4.12 million baht set aside for additional facilities such as roads, a water tower, parking space and roadside drains.

The storage building, with its 600sqm of interior space, is expected to cost 4.5 million baht. All donated supplies will be stored there.





A budget has not been dedicated for fitting out the interior of the buildings, and office materials will be moved from the old office.


Chalerm Rakmark, Chief of Operations at Phuket Provincial Public Works Office, told the Gazette, "The first phase [both buildings] will be finished about April next year.

"The remaining area of the site will be used for the future Phuket Red Cross projects, including a blood bank, a multi-purpose building, canteen and guard houses."

The project has been designed and is being built by contractor PK 2001 Limited Partnership under the inspection of the Phuket Provincial Public Works Office.

Below, Chalerm Rakmark says the first phase will be complete in about five months.






"I love nature and I want to help people make good choices for other people who love nature too," he says.



#### Gardening

here's water all around us. I know that's a bit obvious, given that we're on an island, but water really is everywhere.

Apparently there's water even on Mars. Following its most recent mission to the Red Planet, NASA released color photographs showing where water can be found on the Martian surface.

A NASA scientist explained, "Whenever we've seen pictures of Mars before, they've always been black and white. It turns out the water's been there all along, we just couldn't see it."

As a result of this momentous news, NASA is now preparing a series of missions to send humans to Mars. As the atmosphere is immensely toxic, big domes will need to be erected to house the first settlers. However, as NASA now knows of the vast water supplies, it will be able to produce inexhaustible amounts of oxygen easily and quickly.

Boeing is said to be in cooperation with NASA to build the first large scale ships to carry first human colonists, settlers and supplies to the red planet.

## Solving woes of watering

pletely fictitious, and I can't even take any credit for it. Mark Lowton of The Spoof.com deserves that.

In Phuket, water is much easier to come by and, as the dry season approaches, the need for supplementing normal rainfall in your garden increases. But when to water? That's not an easy question to answer.

One of the most important factors in successful gardening is knowing when and how to water. Most things you do to your garden, such as fertilizing, pest control and pruning, have easy-to-learn rules. Watering has when and how

much to water depends on the kinds of plants, type of soil, time of year and weather conditions.

I suppose the bottom line is to water only when plants need watering. Sometimes they make it easy for you. The leaves of many plants will begin to curl in the early stages of a water shortage. Later, the leaves will become limp; at that stage it's officially wilted. Ideally, plants should be watered before they wilt. Allowing them to wilt frequently will result in excessive leaf dropand, long-term, the plants may never bounce back.



no specific rules, Watering the garden is a good time to do some daydreaming however, because about living on Mars, perhaps.

Some plants may not show symptoms of a water shortage until it is too late, so they should be watered when the soil around them feels dry and crumbly. Recent plantings need a bit of extra TLC. Bear in mind that when plants were in containers in the garden center, water was probably applied every day. Also, during the first few months after being planted in a garden, new plants have only fairly small root systems and can absorb water only from a limited area under-

Keep a close watch on the

lawn, too. If it starts to change color, even a bit, it probably needs water. If the edges of the grass leaves start to curl and take on a dull, bluish-gray color, water the lawn. Those spinning sprinklers are the cheapest, as you can just attach them to the end of a hose and move them to where you want them.

Watering should be done in the early morning or evening, when temperatures are lower. Water in the heat of the day, and much of what comes out of the hose just disappears through evaporation, which is a bit of a waste of time – and water.

When watering, give the soil a thorough soaking. Frequent, light sprinklings just waste water and do little to satisfy the water requirements of a plant growing in a hot, dry soil. This style of watering also promotes shallow root systems, which increases susceptibility to damage if you forget to water for a few days.

A much better theory of wa-

tering is to make sure that water reaches down to a depth of about 20 centimeters. This type of watering allows roots to readily absorb the water. With pot plants, 3cm of water is sufficient for the sandy soils we have in Phuket. However, because all soils and plants are not alike, don't rely on this too much – you may need to make some adjustments.

To figure out when a sprinkler has delivered 3 cm of water, place open cans or cartons at intervals in the spray pattern and water until the water level in the cans averages 3 cm. Not exactly rocket science.

Water should be applied only as fast as the soil will absorb it. Watering with a hose nozzle turned on full force can do more damage than good. Fastflowing water runs off quickly carrying soil with it and exposing plant roots to the sun. More efficient watering can be accomplished with soaker hoses and sprinklers. Soaker hoses do a good job, but they don't cover as large an area as sprinklers.


I've seen Thai gardeners not only soak the ground, but wet the leaves, too. I'm honestly not sure what that does, but they seem to think it's a good idea, and it obviously works, as Phuket is hardly short of nurtured gardens.

I think it's safe to say that there's a lot more water here in Phuket than there is on Mars. I suppose I really should apologize for the water-on-Mars story. Then again, I rather like the idea of a McMars. With a glass of water, obviously.
