### Boy driver dies in speeding motorcycle smash

KOH KAEW: A 12-year-old boy died when he crashed his motor-cycle while overtaking a car on a curved section of Thepkrasattri Rd on Tuesday.

Pol Lt Apichart Rainchana of Phuket Police Station identified the boy as Adisak Det-aran, a student at Baan Sapam Mongkol Wittaya School.

He was still in his student uniform when police arrived at

the accident scene, about 4:30 pm.

The first-year high-school student was returning north to his home in Tambon Srisoonthorn from Phuket City, Lt Apichart said

Riding his parents' black Honda Wave at high speed and without a helmet, Adisak tried to overtake a car on the left, Lt Apichart explained.

The bike grazed the side of the car, then Adisak smashed into

a guard rail and plummeted about 10 meters into a roadside ravine, where a sharp stick punctured his lung, Lt Apichart said.

He was dead by the time witnesses were able to get to his body, which was later taken to Vachira Phuket Hospital.

Adisak's home room teacher, Sangsuthin Krueasane, said that Adisak was a friendly boy and a diligent student.

"This is terrible news for us. I talked with the students this

morning and told them that Adisak's death should be an example for them. Adisak had only started riding his parents' motorbike to school a few days before," K. Sangsuthin said.

"Our teachers meet with parents at the beginning of every term and ask them not to let underage children ride motorcycles to school," she added.

That can apply for a motorcycle driving license from the age of 15.

# Homemade bombs blast new houses

CHALONG: Three houses were badly damaged by improvised explosive devices (IEDs) that detonated about 2:30 am on November 25. Police believe the blasts were motivated by a land dispute. No one was killed in the blasts, but two Burmese workmen were reported injured.

The houses are located in a rural residential development on Soi Songkun, Moo 1, Nabon, Chao Fa Rd East.

Chalong Police Superintendent Pol Col Chalit Kaewyarat told the *Gazette* that the 10 rai of land on which the homes stand is reclaimed tin-mining land.

The homeowners, who financed the building of the properties themselves, said that they hold *TorBor 5* title deeds for the land. Approximately 100 families live on the land.

Samrung Mookwat, 33, had just moved into one of the houses. His two-story property, which cost him a reported 2 million baht to build, was destroyed in the blast, although he was not at home at the time. The other two houses were still under construction.

Chalong Police have several suspects and will contact the Land Office as part of their in-

vestigation, Col Chalit said.

Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Pol Col Prasit Sriwatanapong said the IEDs were homemade "fertilizer bombs".

He reported that other attacks, involving firearms and arson, have taken place in the past year or so. "The investigation might involve former suspects, although arrests have yet to be made. We are gathering more evidence first," he said.

Col Chalit added that the police will liaise with the Phuket

Provincial Land Department to investigate if there are any other claims on the land.

Speaking to the *Gazette*, The President of the Soi Songkun Residents' Association, Komit Phumi, said, "The people who live here are generally quite poor and don't have personal enemies.

"My feeling is that these 'accidents' and attacks are being orchestrated by people who have seen the value of the land here rise, and they want to scare us off so that they can buy the land cheaply."

### Rawai sea gypsies spared their homes

RAWAI: Four sea gypsy houses slated for demolition have been spared the wrecking ball in the Phuket Provincial Highway Office's (PPHO) road-widening project in Rawai.

Sarayuth Intarawichien of the PPHO said that the road-widening project will be finished on target by March next year.

The project began in May and extends along Chao Fa West Rd, from Darasamut intersection to Chalong Circle and on to Rawai Beach.

"We were flexible in building this road, basing it on the physical characteristics of the area, which is why some parts of the road are narrower than the original design.

"The road is designed to be 20.6 meters wide, but has been reduced to about 18.6m near the sea gypsies' houses, but the reduced width does not affect traffic," he said.

# Accidents, crime rated Phuket's biggest threats

PHUKET: Despite fears of terrorism, natural disasters and health pandemics, government officials rate everyday crime and road accidents as the greatest dangers to Phuket's tourism industry, a Phuket Provincial Tourism Management Strategy (PPTRMS) workshop revealed on Tuesday, November 21.

During the workshop, at the Royal Phuket City Hotel, government officials were presented with the results of a survey from the previous workshop, held on August 22, when attendees were divided into four groups.

Each group was asked to collectively assign a "likelihood" and "consequence" rating of 1, 2 or 3 to 12 potential threats, with the total "level of risk" calculated as the product of the two ratings.

The overall results found that "crime" had the highest overall risk level (7) on average, followed by "road accidents" (6).

Other potential threats were rated as follows:

- Fire, marine accidents, drought: 4
- Terrorism, tsunami, health pandemic: 3
- Flood/storms, landslides, earthquakes, pollution: 2
  - Lack of medical care: 1

Not included in the overall results, however, was the threat to tourism posed by "migrant labor", which was assessed by only one of the four groups.

This group felt that migrant labor posed the greatest danger to Phuket's tourism, with a likelihood rating of 3 and a consequence rating of 3, for a combined "level of risk" of 9.

The workshop featured talks by Loy Rego from the Asian Disaster Preparedness Center (ADPC) and ADPC Acting Director Phijit Rattakul, as well as Ian Kean, Executive Director of the APEC International Center for Sustainable Tourism.

There to hear the expert advice were Phuket Provincial Administration Organization President Anchalee Vanich-Thepabutr and representatives from the Phuket offices of the Tourism Authority of Thailand, Marine Police, Royal Thai Police, Tourist Police and the Public Health Office.

The first workshop, held in April, outlined the national disaster warning system.

The second, in August, focused on the dangers to tourism posed by illegal foreign laborers.

A fourth PPTRMS workshop is planned to be held in early

Tuk-tuk driver Wisut Jampa, 40, told police that he had negotiated a fare of 200 baht to take Bennett back to his hotel. Upon arriving there, Bennett, who Wisut said was drunk, began arguing about the fare, saying the normal rate was 100 baht.

Bennett then took out 120 baht and threw it in his face, then began throwing punches at him, the tuk-tuk driver told police.

Wisut then went to the glove compartment of the tuk-tuk and grabbed a folding knife, which he used to stab Bennett. As Bennett ran to the hotel to seek assistance, Wisut fled the scene.

Wisut was released on bail but still faces criminal charges for the stabbing, Capt Leucha said, and any additional witnesses are urged to come forward.

# Former Kathu Land Office Chief sentenced to 20 years in prison

KARON: Seventy Burmese workers celebrating a friend's wedding were arrested and taken to Chalong Police Station after a neighbor complained that they were singing too loud.

Pol Maj Peeranat Chatinkaew told the *Gazette* that Chalong Police Station office received a complaint about 1:30 am on November 21.

Police were told that Burmese workers behind Wat Karon were "disturbing the peace" by singing karaoke too loud.

Some of them had been drinking, he said.

When police arrived at the scene the group quickly scattered, but police captured nearly all of them.

The 20 members deemed to have been causing the most noise were fined 500 baht each before the entire group was released, Maj Peeranat added.

BANGKOK (*The Nation*): The Criminal Court in Bangkok on November 27 sentenced former Kathu Land Office Chief Bunchoo Limraksasin to 20 years in prison after finding him guilty on 10 counts of demanding bribes for land titles between December 21, 2001 and March 8, 2003.

The court also found a second defendant in the case, 34-year-old Meena Kalra, guilty on seven counts of conspiring to launder money for Bunchoo. She was sentenced to seven years in prison.

The court heard testimony that Bunchoo had accumulated 5.4 million baht from processing land titles for one woman in 2002, including a final payment of 2 million baht in cash delivered in a gift-wrapped box to Bunchoo by the woman's land broker.

A warrant was issued for Bunchoo's arrest after the woman reported him to police, but Bunchoo, who was transferred to

After a manhunt in Phuket and Phang Nga in July that year, officers from the Crime Suppression Division eventually arrested Bunchoo in Ranong on July 20, after his return from the Andaman Club casino and resort in Myanmar.

The charges against Bun-

choo stated that he transferred more than 17 million baht to two bank accounts in Meena's name and bought a 2.1-million-baht condominium for her in Bangkok's Phaya Thai District.

Both defendants strenuously denied all charges, as well as allegations that they had been involved in an adulterous affair.

Regardless, the court found Bunchoo's denial of bribe demands and money transfers unconvincing, noting in its summary that it was unusual that Bunchoo's wife was unaware of the large transactions involving Meena.

Noting that Meena's monthly salary was only 5,000 baht, the court also found unconvincing her claim that she was able to amass 17 million baht in personal savings.

Meena had been employed as a part-time helper at the Kathu Land Office when Bunchoo was also employed there.

## B2m of ya bah seized in Thalang

THALANG: Police seized 6,800 *ya bah* (methamphetamine) pills and arrested two men in a sting operation on November 23.

The total haul had a street value of about 2 million baht.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pol Maj Gen Decha Budnampeth said that undercover officers had arrested Chatree Waiyawut, 26, and Songcherd Krodsimai, 28.

The men were charged with possession of *ya bah* with intent to sell.

Construction of the complex began in 1992. In 1996, it finally opened as a shopping mall under the auspices of Lucky Seafood Co, part of the Kata Group of companies, which leased the building from the province.

Within a year the deal soured, however. Tenants left the new mall en masse after discovering that Lucky Seafood had not yet installed basic utilities, including electricity – nor did it have the funds to do so.

Following the failure of the shopping mall, the building stood abandoned by all except drug users and youth gangs, grateful for the shelter and dark corners the complex provided.

In 2002, the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) stepped in to reclaim the complex for the province on the grounds that Lucky Seafood had failed in its promise to turn the complex into something beneficial to the province and, perhaps more pressingly, had also failed to pay the rent for a twoyear period.

After waiting another two years, the OrBorJor finally launched new plans for the building. The homeless were to be moved out, replaced by a highend duty-free store to be run by Royal Sawasdee Co Ltd under a 20-year concession.

The deal should have proved lucrative for the *OrBorJor*, with Royal Sawasdee agreeing to pay about half a million baht per month in rent. Following the downturn in tourism after the 2004 tsunami, however, the deal fell through. The ill-fated building was again handed back to the OrBorJor.

At the beginning of this year, the OrBorJor floated an ambitious new plan to redevelop the whole 80 rai of land it owns in Saphan Hin, including Lucky

# Will fortunes change for

When its construction began 14 years ago, the Lucky Complex shopping center was heralded as a major new money-spinner for the province and the center point for the rejuvenation of Saphan Hin. Since then, the complex has proved to be a white elephant, with every attempt to put it to use failing. Here *Gazette* Reporter Supanun Supawong and **Desk Editor Dominic** Earnshaw examine the history of the project and **Phuket Provincial** Administration Organization's latest plan for the abandoned department store and the 80rai area it occupies.

The top four floors of the six-story building would be used to house new OrBorJor offices, as well as a science education area. Only the bottom two floors would have to contend with the vagaries of the business world. Ideas included renting them out to private companies or creating an IT center, K. Anchalee said.

Plans for a duty-free store in Saphan Hin have still not been completely abandoned, OrBor-Jor Deputy President Suthep Thepsakul said last month.

"We would like to find a

duty-free company or a superstore to rent the first two floors of the complex. This, however, depends on whether any companies are interested. The OrBorJor will repaint the inside of the building, but all other renovation work will have to be done by the tenants. The companies

will rent the space from the OrBorJor and pay water and electricity bills themselves. At the moment, we have still not set the rental price," he said.

"The third and fourth floors will serve as the new OrBorJor offices. All of the OrBorJor staff will be transferred there as the

offices we have now [part of the Phuket Provincial Hall complex] are too small. After all our officers have moved to the new offices we will consider putting our old building up for rent," K. Suthep explained.

The fifth and sixth floors will be an educational science center called the Andaman Learning Center. The center will aim to spread knowledge about

science and astronomy to young people and students. We are hoping to install a planetarium as well.

"The center will focus on educating young people from Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi. The OrBorJor will employ science experts from universities or private companies to run the

"About 70% of the goods on sale will be from Phuket OTOP schemes and the remaining 30% will be from other provinces, especially Phang Nga and Krabi," he said.

project. The *OrBorJor* is now waiting to hear from experts with design ideas for the center.

"We think that work on the project should be finished by mid-2007," K. Suthep said.

That might seem quite ambitious, given the fact that the work has yet to commence.

OrBorJor Chief Architect Prachya Sukkeaw said that work on Lucky Complex had not yet started because the OrBorJor has still not decided on the project's contractor.

The money is available, however. At a meeting on November 7, 2006, the OrBorJor announced that construction of its new offices is budgeted at 85 million baht, with another 53 million baht earmarked for the Andaman Learning Center.

The redevelopment of the Lucky Complex is only one part of the *OrBorJor* plan for Saphan Hin. Another key part of the program is the conversion of the nearby Thai boxing stadium into a market for One Tambon One Product (OTOP) goods, K. Suthep explained.

"The Thai boxing stadium will be reopened in a new location, but we haven't discussed where yet. It will probably stay in the Saphan Hin area, though it could be moved somewhere else entirely," said K. Suthep.

Vendors currently operating out of a dilapidated row of onestory shops in the same area are also included in the redevelopment plans for the area. The OrRar Iar has deemed their buildings unattractive and ill-fitting with its vision.

Somprasong Eimsakul, Secretary to the *OrBorJor* President, explained that the vendors will be rehoused in 52 new two-story shop shophouses, 38 of which will be built by the OrBorJor and rented out.

The remaining 14 units will be built by private individuals according to design specifications laid down by the *OrBorJor*. The owners will then have to pay land rent to the OrBorJor at the rate of 750 baht per year, K. Somprasong said.

# THE ROOT OF SUFFERING

devout monk in Phattalung's Kongra District took the quest for non-attachment to an unprecedented level recently, when he cut off his erect penis, which was was distracting him during a meditation session.

News of the story was revealed after the monk, Phra Niwat Kaewnopparat (aka Phra Boonlert), was transferred on November 22 to Maharaj Hospital in Nakhon Sri Thammarat, where he denied offers by doctors to reattach the severed member.

Phra Boonlert, described as highly devout by villagers and fellow clergy at a remote temple in Tambon Klongsai, was practicing Vipassana "insight" meditation on November 11 when he was distracted by the erection.

He had earlier told relatives that he had encountered problems of "distraction" that affected his meditation, but never specifically mentioned that sexual urges were the source of the interference.

That fact only became apparent when villagers heard screams for help coming from

devout monk in Phattalung's Kongra Dispm

Rushing to assist, a villager found blood streaming down the monk's leg and his severed four-inch penis laying next to a small length of wood, used as a makeshift cutting board to slice off the offending organ with a sharp knife.

He was rushed to Kongra Hospital for treatment by villagers, who collected the severed organ, wrapped it in a plastic bag and put it on ice in the hope it could be reattached.

Phra Boonlert told them their action was not necessary, as he no longer had any use for the organ.

At last report, doctors at the hospital continued to keep the monk sedated and under close observation – even though his wound was healing well.

People who know Phra Boonlert said this was unnecessary as he had never previously displayed any signs of mental illness. He was only more ardent in pursuing the path to enlightenment than other monks, they said.

# Water wonderful world

ong-gone are the days when the most fun to be had on the water within a short distance of the shore was with the help of the lilo – the inflatable air mattress, that is, not the village in Armargh, Northern Ireland – or the near-ubiquitous inflatable dinghy of European seaside holidays, last seen being used by refugees trying to row across La Manche.

No, really, it was. Just Google "inflatable dinghy channel" if you are in doubt.

The Andaman Water Park (AWP), the brainchild of managers Vincent and Jazon Edouard, from Paris, uses inflatables, but not the type to have graced Thai shores before.

Filled with inflatable rides, a 6.5-meter-high pyramid, human catapults, bridges and even a floating bar – serving non-alcoholic drinks; remember, this is aimed at children and families, not just adults – the park looks likely to breathe fresh life into the island's main playground, Patong.

The park, due to open this month on the beach across from the Patong Bay Garden Resort will be a 5,000-square-meter play area stretching some 150 meters into the bay.

Other attractions in the park

- which Vincent reported will
have a maximum capacity of 200
people – will include rolling logs,
"Tarzan" swings, a floating

bridge, trampolines as well as low-powered inflatable sea scooters, each propelled by an electric motor. Sure to be of interest to young and old alike will be the "gladiator"-style games, which include jousting and a novel form

of kendo played with what look like oversized cotton buds.

Also available will be water-walkers – imagine a giant-size hamster ball with space, not for a rodent, but a human.

Vincent, whose career began in the hospitality industry, explained that the water-walker is zipped up and inflated around the customer, who can then roll the transparent globe over the

"Although it's difficult to have a favorite, the water-walker is possibly my choice. The bottom of the walker gives a wonderful view of sea life," explained Vincent.

"I have used them, and the sensation is really something special; you feel that you're on the water, with all the sensations of floating, but without getting wet.

"We will also have Aqua-Skippers, which are a little like stand-up bicycles. They are powered by the rider and can reach speeds of up to 30kmh.

"Safety," continued Vincent, "is vital. Of course, we want people to have fun, but we have made safe fun the priority. There will be 15 lifeguards, a rescue vessel, life jackets that are mandatory for children under 12 and recommended for everyone else – children under 12 must also be

under parental control – and we have comprehensive insurance through AXA."

The floats – made from UV-treated commercial-grade PVC – will, he added, be anchored to the sea bed, and the whole area will be roped off with pontoons to prevent jet-skis and other craft coming too close.

"Water parks similar to this are quite a common concept in Europe, the US and Australia, for example, but I don't think that there is another in Asia, certainly not another in Thailand," he said.

He added that the admission charge for a day's fun is a flatrate of 250 baht for adults and children alike.

"One of the great things about the AWP is that it's not going to harm the environment.


"Also, the only noise will be from people having fun, not jetskis or speedboats towing parascenders," said Vincent.

Messing about on the water just took on a whole new meaning.

# Unlucky day for Lucky's mahout

22-year-old mahout was killed by his musth-crazed elephant on November 19, when the pair were working in a rubber plantation in Nakhon Sri Thammarat. The animal had a history of aggressive behavior and had once trampled the car of a former provincial governor.

According to witnesses, the victim, Aekarat Bunmuang, had been hired to move logs in the plantation. As he was working, his charge, a 35-year-old bull elephant called Chok Dee ("Lucky"), became agitated and threw him to the ground.

Chok Dee then gored K. Aekarat repeatedly in the face with his tusks before stomping on his chest.

K. Aekarat somehow managed to scream for help, but no one came to his assistance until Chok Dee had calmed down, by which time Aekarat was unconscious. Villagers then managed to tie Chok Dee between two trees and sent K. Aekarat to hospital, where he died.

Aekarat had forced him to work for many days without giving him a proper rest, which caused him to be agitated.

**Road rash:** Police had to rescue a driver from a lynch mob enraged at the death of their friend in a traffic accident in Lansaka, Nakon Sri Thammarat, in the early hours of November 24.

The mob later launched an attack on the hospital where the injured man was taken and also surrounded the district police station when the driver was transferred there.

The violence was sparked by the death of 23-year-old Pramot Khrutkhlaow, who was knocked off his motorcycle after a collision with a car driven by Nathaphong Thamathoon, 27, while driving back from a local bar.

Pramot's passengers, Sanchai Jitsompong and Jatuphon Hiranrak, both 23, were also injured in the accident.

Pol Lt Col Suphot Khongnaluek, an Investigator at Lansaka District Police Station, said that investigators had learned that before the accident, Pramot and his friends got drunk in a bar.

On the way back from the bar, Pramot's motorcycle and Nathaphong's car collided.

When Pramot's friends, who were following on motorcycles, saw what had happened, they seized Nathaphong and began to beat him. They also tried to smash his car, Col Suphot said.

By the time police arrived at the scene, about 10 youths were attacking Nathaphong, but they fled when they saw the officers approach.

As Nathaphong was being treated for his injuries in Lansa-ka Hospital, the gang arrived at the hospital and tried to continue their attack. Police then took him to Lansaka District Police Station where they could guarantee his safety.

The gang, however, followed Nathaphong to the police station, where they demanded that he be returned to the hospital so

# Domestic violence cases soar

of domestic abuse Lagainst women and children were lodged across the country over the past 12 months, a sharp increase from the previous year, Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) Spokesman Supan Srithamma has announced.

There were 14,382 victims of violence from October 2005 to September this year, with 7,164 victims younger than 18. The total number of reports was 40% more than in the previous year, he said.

The figures showed that on average 39 women and children were victims of violence every day in Thailand.

Just over half of the incidents reported were physical abuse, followed by sexual assaults at 43%. Boyfriends or friends made up more than a third of the attackers, followed by husbands at 24% and relatives at 15%.

Alcohol was a factor in about 28% of the attacks, while 24% were caused by jealousy.

Of the victims, 8,797 had to undergo mental rehabilitation.

MoPH efforts to deal with the problem include the ministry's nationwide network of 104 "One-Stop Crisis Centers" and its 1669 help hotline, K. Supan said.

Silence of the lambs: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) will seek National Legislative Assembly (NLA) action over 38 alleged "silence killings" during the Thaksin Shinawatra administrations "War on Drugs".

Commissioner Wasant Panich accused the Thaksin government of "doing nothing" about 38 specific killings it had investigated.

The commission received 40 complaints stemming from the 2003 War on Drugs. The investigation concluded that 38 people who died during the campaign had no history of drug dealing, K. Wasant said.

The NHRC reported its findings to the previous government, but they were ignored, he

Toxin tax: A network of health and environmental advocates and economists is drafting a bill aimed at taxing the producers and distributors of chemicals for use in agriculture based on the toxicity

One of the group's members, Assoc Professor Teerana Bhongmakapat of Chulalongkorn University's Faculty of Economics, explained that unlike in the industrial sector, the use of chemicals in the agriculture sector lacks proper control. This results in excessive use that leaves toxic residue in the environment, especially in groundwater, he said

The group wants the money raised by the tax be put into a new fund to be spent on a scheme to gradually convert the country's conventional farming to organic agriculture, heal the chemical-induced damage done to the environment and ensure food safety.

The highest tax rate of 30% is suggested for the most toxic group of agricultural chemicals, including pesticides and insecticides, with less toxic chemicals such as fertilizers subjected to lower tax rates.

Candy caper: A construction worker used a cigarette lighter resembling a pistol to rob a 7-Eleven store in Bangkok, but was arrested after he returned to the convenience store to get the fivebaht candy he had forgotten there, police said.

About 3 am on November 23, Thongsuk Fangnin, 29, twice walked in and out of the store in

Bueng Kum District before buying a five-baht pack of candy on his third trip. He then pointed the cigarette lighter at the cashier and demanded the money in the cash register, all 1,600 baht.

When Thongsuk walked back to the convenience store to get the candy he left behind, the clerk remembered him as coming from a nearby construction camp and called the police.

He was apprehended with the lighter that looked like a 9mm handgun and 1,400 baht in cash. After being booked for armed robbery, he told police he was stressed out from a fight with his girlfriend and wanted money to go home to Srisaket Province, so he drank three cans of beer and held up the store.

The death of rock: Bangkok Rock Festival 2007, initially scheduled for February 10 and 11, has been canceled - mainly due to the government's ban on alcohol advertising set to take effect on December 3.

Riverman Asia Company announced the cancellation of the rock festival, saying that it would be difficult to find sponsors for the event with the virtual ban on alcohol advertising.

"Such a big event is going to cost more than 80 million baht because international rock stars will be part of this festival," the company said.

**Unscheduled stop:** Five people, including two foreign tourists, were trapped in a malfunctioning elevator at Suvarnabhumi Airport for 40 minutes before they were rescued by staff.

Sasaphak Mangmool, a tour guide, said two airport staff finally arrived after she kept pressing an emergency button inside the glass elevator for 15 minutes.

"They stood and watched but did nothing to help. Five or six security guards showed up after quite a while, but none of them did anything to help us," she

She said some of them kept looking inside and smiling the whole time, for reasons she did not know.

She and the others had to put their noses up to the overhead fan inside the elevator to get some air, because the temperature rose uncomfortably.

After 40 minutes, two maintenance workers arrived and opened the elevator doors, she said.

ollowing the recent announcement of the crackdown on company nominees, and especially on those companies with foreign shareholders, foreign-run businesses in the area are reporting that they are being audited by the Revenue Department, sometimes going back two to three years.

While this in itself is not extraordinary, many foreign business owners feel frustrated that Thai firms and unregistered business are not facing the same scrutiny.

In some cases, foreigners are working in unregistered businesses, tour agencies, restaurants and real estate companies without paying taxes or having work permits.

Foreigners who abide by the rules – are VAT-registered and registered with the Tourism Authority of Thailand, pay social security for their Thai staff, have work permits and licenses – feel that it is unfair that they are following the law 100%, yet are still being targeted by the tax authorities for audits.

Meanwhile, foreigners who are breaking the law on many counts are going unmolested.

There are cases where there are several businesses in the same area: some foreignowned and fully legal, and others either unregistered or Thaiowned with illegal foreign employees.

The foreign businesses that are fully compliant with all regulations are being audited, while the other businesses are ignored.

In several instances where complaints have been made to the authorities about this type of situation, the answer has been something to the effect of, "We are too busy." Too busy investi-

# Volvo switches gears



The C70 was originally conceived and developed by race car driver Tom Walkinshaw's TWR car company in 1997 and was built at a facility 51%-owned by Tom in Uddevalla, in western Sweden. More than 50,000 cars were built until it was discontinued in March 2005.

Now TWR has gone bust and the factory is 60% owned by Turin styling house Pininfarina and 40% by Volvo. The second generation C70 has been jointly engineered and developed by these two companies.

The latest C70 started life as a conventional coupe, says Volvo, but the design team, headed by Fedde Talsma, decided to "open it up" with a convertible top. The new car is shorter and lower to the ground than its predecessor, but retains the same width. Unlike some of its rivals,

it is a full four-seater, with wide opening doors to facilitate access to the rear seats.

While the C70 may not be the first coupe convertible on the market, it is the first in the premium segment with a three-piece top. It takes less than 30 seconds for the roof to disappear into its dedicated trunk compartment.

CRUISE CONTROL: Hidden behind the chic interior is a built-in sound system that can blast the passengers with 910W speakers.





However, with the roof down, trunk capacity is halved, but a trunk divider makes it easy to assess how much luggage can be accommodated when the roof is low-

The interior is modern and typically Scandinavian in design with clean surfaces, genuine materials and a sound degree of functionality. There is also a cabin air filter and an advanced air quality monitor works by shutting out or removing unhealthy particles, gases and odors, ensuring the air occupants breathe is as clean and healthy as possible.

An open-closed car is a serious challenge to an audio engineer, but in the C70 occupants can experience a world-class sound system, complete with a mind boggling 910W output, Dynaudio speakers and dual subwoofers behind the backrests. To cope with the changeable conditions from closed to open configuration, Volvo has invested in the latest digital technology to adapt the sound system and maintain consistent reproduction.

Two engines are available in

Thailand: a five-cylinder 2.4i with continuous variable valve timing on the inlet side, or a five-cylinder, turbocharged 20-valve model with variable timing on both inlet and exhaust camshafts. The 2.4i produces 170 bhp (125 kW); the T5 220 bhp. Performance figures are a 0-100 kmh sprint time of 10 seconds for the smaller unit, eight seconds for the T5. Maximum speed is 215 and 235 kmh respectively.

More significantly, the torque output of the T5 is a strong 320 Nm, produced between 1500 and 4800 rpm. The 2.4-liter model still offers good torque of 230 Nm, but peaks at 4400 rpm.

Both cars are only offered with a five-speed automatic transmission in this market.

Volvo expects to sell 16,000 of the C70 annually, with half of that total going to the US. The UK and Germany will account for roughly 30%, with the remainder going to other markets, including Thailand. According to Volvo Cars' research, half of all C70 coupé-convertibles will be owned by women.

Prices are 4.19m baht for the 2.4i, 4.79m for the T5.





# Road Rage – the battleground

n one of the worst cases of road rage reported to police in Germany, a man flung a three-kilogram sledgehammer through the windshield of a BMW driven by a woman on a busy motorway outside Munich. The hammer landed on the rear seat of the car, narrowly missing the woman's head.

The woman was lucky to escape serious injury. In the United States and Britain several drivers lost their lives when they were attacked by knife-wielding or gun-slinging fellow motorists.

Such incidents of road rage have captured the public imagination and every motorist has her or his story to tell of an incident involving unruly drivers.

Stresses of modern day life including work pressure, traffic congestion, the weather, noise levels and time constraints are some of the many factors fueling road rage. But it is a complex phenomenon with many aspects.

A study conducted by British stress expert Dr David Lewis has found that commuters experience greater stress than fighter pilots or riot policemen, which might partly explain the aggression.

The spectacular cases of road rage have also nurtured the

impression that aggression on the road is increasing, but there are no reliable statistics to support that idea.

A survey conducted in Australia, Canada, the UK and the US by www.roadragers.com found that more than two-thirds of motorists are ired by another driver tailgating and encouraging them to speed up and go faster. In all four countries most respondents conceded using obscene

gestures with other drivers.

Simple human courtesy however can be enough to defuse a situation and potentially save your life. Signaling to the other driver that one is sorry if one has made a mistake can often prevent a situation from escalating. Some of the tips offered by roadragers. com are:

• Don't tailgate, and if someone wants to pass, move over and let the driver by.

• Don't make inappropriate hand or facial gestures

• Use your horn sparingly and if you do encounter an aggressive driver, avoid eye contact and steer clear, giving the angry driver plenty of room.

Austrian human behavior expert Klaus Atzwanger believes man has tricked evolution with the motor vehicle as far as speed is concerned, but has not adapted behavior accordingly. He compares the car to the thigh bone held by cave men to defend his territory and to measure his strength with others.

For incurable road ragers there is a way out. In the *Road Rage School*, a TV show in Britain, several experts confront the ragers with the worst aspects of their aggression and attempt to change their behavior.

All the participants are nominated by a close friend of family member fearing their behavior could cause them to end up dead or in prison.

It is a lesson in how perfectly amenable pedestrians can "turn into boorish thugs at the turn of an ignition key," the newspaper, *The Independent*, surmised.

The experts differ on how best to deal with the problem. Punishment with steep fines and more police control, says one school, while the other calls for technical solutions already available such as automatic distance and speed controls.

Traffic experts in Germany agree, however, that past attempts at educating drivers with expensive billboard advertising campaigns have had virtually zero effect.

Moby by the multi-million selling artiste should be taken with a pinch of salt. It was hopefully written with his tongue firmly in cheek.

Ear Candy By Andy Johnstone

Go, released last month, spans the years 1991 to 2006, including this year's contribution and ubiquitous single New York, New York with Blondie's Debbie Harry.

The international version of the album available in Phuket – five different versions have been produced to serve the UK, French, US, South American and international markets – kicks off with *Natural Blues* from his most commercially-successful and critically-acclaimed release, 1999's *Play*.

Play was also the first album to have all of its tracks licensed for use in movies, television shows or commercials. One

of the more notable advertisements features Tiger Woods playing golf around New York to the tune of Moby's *Find My Baby*, which is also featured on the new album.

At least 25 of his recordings have been used in about 48 films,

TV shows, advertisements, video games and documentaries, eclipsing even Fat Boy Slim, with Moby's ambient piece GodMoving Over the Face of the Waters and Porcelain featured in five different productions apiece, the former in Heat and Syriana, the latter in The Beach.

One of the more interesting

aspects of *Play* is the way in which it combines old folk-music rhythms with modern techno; Moby sampled heavily from the collected works of Alan Lomax on tracks such as *Honey*, *Find My Baby* and *Natural Blues*. This created a sound that was unique among the music that was being released at the time.

While the album *Play* also has some more standard electronic tracks and ambient pieces, the fusion of gospel and techno is what this album is most remembered for. Five tracks from *Play* feature on *Go*.

Go, the single, is a reworking of Angelo Badalamenti's Laura Palmer Theme from the unsettling early-'90s TV series Twin Peaks.

Moby's hard techno reworking of Monty Norman's James Bond Theme was used in

the 1997 Bond film *Tomorrow Never Dies*, perhaps making an appearance on this compilation to coincide with the release of *Casino Royale*.

An odd omission from *Go* and Moby's canon of music used in films is *Extreme Ways*, heard first on 2002's *18*. This album follows a similar path to *Play*, using samples of old field recordings of African American spirituals, for example, and combining them with mellow dance beats.

18 is, however, far more

melancholy, perhaps reflecting the events of 9/11, which coincided with the native New Yorker's 36<sup>th</sup> birthday.

In a slight nod toward Bond, Extreme Ways became the main theme to both Matt Damon films The Bourne Identity and The Bourne Supremacy, and may well feature in next year's The Bourne Ultimatum.

We Are All Made Of Stars from 18 makes a welcome appearance. The subtle increasing complexity of the guitar chords –

reminiscent of Aztec Camera's cover of Van Halen's *Jump* – combine with deft lyrics such as:

Efforts of lovers/Left in my mind/I sing in the reaches/We'll see what we find./People they come together/People they fall apart/No one can stop us now/'Cause we are all made of stars.

Go also features the glorious, uplifting dance-hymn In My Heart from 18 and an achingly-beautiful rendition of Slipping Away (Crier La Vie) from 2005's Hotel, with the delightful Mylène Farmer – the "French Madonna" – providing the French lyrics.

As with so many compilation albums, especially ones following the trend of different tracks for different regions, what has been left out often interests listeners as much as what is included.

There is no *Dream About Me*, no *South Side* and no *Hymn* on the international version, and in regions where these or other tracks are included they are new mixes, sometimes using different vocalists to the known versions.

That said, how could Moby encapsulate a career as eclectic as his? From the start, Moby's strength has been his ability to stand out from his peers.

His early days in hardcore punk sat uncomfortably next to his status as a pioneer of the American rave scene, yet he has managed to release a "Very best of..." that offers the casual listener enough to seek out his other works while giving the Mobyphile enough fond memories to smile at.





urning to the elderly English student who had decided to act as my unofficial tour guide as I meandered along Sunwen Xilu, the city's charismatic main drag, I asked, "What's the best thing about Zhongshan?"

I was expecting some sort of reference to Sun Yat-Sen, the father of modern China, who hailed from these parts.

"Pigeon," came the reply.

For a moment I thought of homing pigeons, or maybe it was some sort of slang term for the scores of unaccompanied and incredibly fashionably dressed young ladies who were browsing for bargains along the pedestrianized street.

Then I recalled that there are few parts of China that don't boast some sort of local culinary delicacy, especially in the south, where it's said, "If it's got four legs and isn't a chair, or flies and isn't an airplane", then it can be eaten.


"Yes, Shiqi pigeon," reiterated the graying gourmand. "Baby ones are best, their bones are softer, the meat's tender and the skin goes all crisp. Shall we try some?"

I pleaded a full stomach, then vegetarianism, then remembered an urgent appointment and fled, leaving behind one puzzled pigeon fancier more mystified than ever about foreigners' eating habits.

For anyone wondering where Zhongshan is, it's a good question.

South of Guangzhou, it's one of the more attractive cities in the Pearl River Delta, and thankfully well away from the beaten tourist track.

There's no Great Wall or Bund to lure the hordes. Instead

it's a prosperous metropolis that has left its heart intact, rather than steamroll it beneath a load of concrete.

Sunwen Xilu was founded by wealthy emigrants in the early 20th century. At No 152, the Commercial Culture Museum, housed in an elegant three-story building that was once the chamber of commerce, has well-interpreted English and relates the stories of more than a few local lads who made good.

A stroll along Sunwen is one of the most pleasant pastimes in Zhongshan, a city highly favored by tourists from Hong Kong as a weekend retreat.

The street is lined for much of the way by twin colonnades, painted in a variety of pastels and housing various shops and boutiques staffed by lively youngsters whose enthusiasm is infectious – although they are mainly selling cheap fashion items and kitschy souvenirs.

The street is backed by Zhongshan Park, which is topped by the 400-year-old Fufeng Cultural Pagoda, a favorite locale for both the tai chi brigade and couples going through their own stylized exercise routines.

Just outside Zhongshan in the village of Cuiheng stands the one-time residence of Dr Sun himself, a point of pilgrimage for students from around the country.

If you're going to start a revolution in somewhere as big as China, it makes sense to compose your plan of action somewhere comfortable, and the good



doctor obviously had ample space to compose his thoughts.

Now converted to a museum, his former pad is more of an honest tribute than downright propaganda, though some might

say that the whole Pearl River Delta – forecast to become one of the world's great manufacturing bases – is his true memorial.

There's no pigeon restaurant in the vicinity, but Zhongshan

itself makes good this deficiency. I'm willing to try most things, but for once sidestepped wolfing down braised baby birds, even if the locals do reckon they're finger lickin' good.

have a job for Thailand's Ministry of Culture. They should launch a campaign to rescue the lowly pah-kowma from extinction.

I bet some readers don't know what a pah-kow-ma is. It's the traditional Thai cloth that men wrap around themselves after taking a bath. It's a simple piece of cotton cloth, a little over two feet wide and a yard long, imprinted with a plaid or checkered pattern. You can see it on sale in most clothing shops. But its apparent simplicity is deceptive.

Other cultures also use a wraparound cloth in the bathroom. The Indians use a gamcha; Nepalis use a *lungi*; Malays use a sarong; Westerners use a large

Thai women traditionally use a sarong, also called a pahthung. But the pah-kow-ma, like its cousin the Cambodian krama, has a multitude of additional uses that make it the indispensable allpurpose cloth.

It can be worn around the head as a turban, strung up as a hammock for babies or tied into a bag to carry things in. It can be used as a shawl, scarf, sheet, towel, napkin, handkerchief, washcloth, dust-cover or tablecloth. It can be folded into a mat to sit on or rolled up into a pillow to sleep on. It can be used as a belt, and on formal occasions can be worn with a tuxedo as a cummerbund.

If you find yourself entering a posh restaurant that requires a necktie, you can quickly turn your pah-kow-ma into one, just so long as the headwaiter isn't looking. In emergencies it can function as a rope, sling or bandage. It can even be used to strangle somebody with if you are homicidally inclined, but this is not recommended because of the legal complications.

The Celtic bard Fonning Toaddy, enthralled by the pahkow-ma's many uses, is composing an ode to it. The opening lines go like this:

The humble pah-kow-ma I sing. It's used for damned near everything.

Of course, these are only the opening lines. It gets better later

You can see that the humble pah-kow-ma symbolizes all the richness of Thai culture in its unspoiled state, before Yuppification smote us with its leprous

hand. It is disappearing rapidly in the cities and is now identified mainly with old people and farmers. Young urban Thais have abandoned it in favor of the bath towel. In fact, I am informed that they laugh at it as being old-fash-

For these reasons, the Min-

istry of Culture ought to be promoting it. Let's have a pah-kowma renaissance. Let's take this noble garment out of the bathroom. In a burst of revolutionary fashion fervor, let's transform it into a trendy item of outdoor wear for both sexes on even the most formal occasions.

At the APEC conference a few years ago, visiting dignitaries were photographed wearing Chinese-style silk jackets that cost 90,000 baht a pop. It would have been much more Thai (and much cheaper) to have had them wear pah-kow-ma at 75 baht a pop.

Tourists must be introduced

to this nifty item. They will quickly fall in love with it, for it is the only garment to wear in Thailand's horrendous heat. Once they return home, they will popularize it among their countrymen.

Properly modified, the *pah*kow-ma can be marketed overseas. In the summer heat, what Scotsman would not trade in his heavy woolen kilt for a sprightly pah-kow-ma patterned in the tartan of his clan? Shrewdly marketed as the MacPah, this Thai garment could easily become as Scottish as bagpipes and haggis.

The Arab headcloth has traditionally come in only three designs: red and white, black and white, or plain white. But the pah-kow-ma would mitigate the monotony and enliven the stern lives of Arabs with a splash of bright plaids. With colorful pahkow-ma adorning their heads, Arabs might lighten up and smile

The Western business suit, too, is notable for its monotony. We could add to it a dashing pahkow-ma, breezily thrown over the shoulder to convey a casual air of with-it hipness.

These innovations will take some smart marketing, but I'm sure the culture ministry is up to the job. The next time Thailand hosts a big international conference, I want to see George W, Hu Jintao and Vladimir Putin wearing pah-kow-ma.

In June, Phuket was awarded the Arabian Travel Market 2006 "New Frontiers Award" for being the tourism destination that recovered fastest from a natural disaster.

When such accolades come in, officials are quick to acknowledge them – often organizing official acceptance ceremonies to bask in the glory of the occasion. But do government officials, hotel owners and other tourism business operators really deserve all the credit?

While not overlooking the much-heralded work these groups have done, there is one group of people on the island who have been integral to the post-tsunami recovery, but whose efforts have been met with brickbats, not bouquets.

That group comprises "foreign laborers", whose presence here was assessed by officials at a recent government workshop as posing a greater "level of risk" to the island's tourism than all other threats considered – including tsunamis, terrorism, crime and road accidents [see News stories].

The term "foreign laborer" is, of course, a polite way of referring to the thousands of desperately-poor Burmese who have migrated to the island to take on dangerous and difficult jobs that many Thais refuse to do – such as in the fishing and construction industries

During the past week, a group of 70 Burmese were arrested for singing too loudly at a wedding party in Karon. They were rounded up and taken to Chalong Police Station, where the 20 loudest of the bunch, as determined by officers there, were fined 500 baht each – a large amount to migrant Burmese, whose wages are scandalously low.

Although all of those arrested were found to have valid work permits, they were still treated in a way highly unlikely to have been considered had they been Western tourists or local Thais, who surely would have been given a warning first.

That the presence of so many poor foreigners here is considered a threat to Phuket is not in question. Any group of people living under such hardship poses some threat to society, whether it be a criminal or even a health threat. However, much less considered is the threat posed to poor people by prejudice and lack of compassion.



### Class at the School of Hard Knocks

There is a group of farangs here on the island that moan and complain about any of the Thai peculiarities, but after living here for 12 years, I have learned that you must accept them, however weird, or go home. That way when something that is either so stupid or downright wrong crops up, we will have the perspective to know we must stand up and say something.

The latest example of an errant policy is the requirement for foreign teachers to possess a BA or higher to teach Thai and foreign children English. It's not enough that they have to work in over-crowded classrooms with poor facilities, getting paid a mere pittance of what they should. Teaching is on par with nursing: the long hours, dedication to children and so on. They should be greatly revered. Isn't that the point of education? To provide them with a good standard of living?

I agree experience and a degree in teaching is required, but to jump it up to BA level is too much. It is surely more important to have enough teachers to give the students an all around education and the fundamentals of a foreign language.

The schools have a hard time paying an acceptable wage to foreign teachers from abroad today, how will they get along when teachers with BAs and higher apply and request salary information? Will the salary scales be improved to account for the higher level of requirement? Teachers, seeing the long list of drawn-out problems with settling in Thailand, will probably shake

their heads and remain at home, or seek positions further afield. Common sense is what is required here.

I see the teachers have rallied and protested as they should, if they require a further flag waver, I will oblige, whatever it costs

In Singapore, at least half of the time, one or both of our kids suffered from a cough and/or runny nose with difficulty sleeping at night. # Meet the new Gov

### FIRST PERSON

fter five years as Phuket Vice Governor, Niran Kalayanamit took over the top provincial post on October 1. With the promotion, Gov Niran became the first-ever Phuket Deputy Governor to be promoted to Governor inside the province.

His past experience includes a long stint as Director of Foreign Affairs at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Bangkok.

At the Channel 11 studios, where he was recently interviewed on the *Andaman Talk* program, Governor Niran told the *Gazette* that his past work on the island has given him valuable experience to cope with his new post, which includes continuing a number of existing provincial programs – and many launching new ones.



ecause I am new to the position, I have to wait for and follow the new government's provincial development policies. Later this week, I will attend "sufficiency economy" meetings hosted by the National Economic and Social Development Board (NESDB). Many issues need to be considered.

A new Vice Governor will be assigned and take up his post on December 4, so at the moment I am still handling many issues while I wait for the new lineup to be in place.

The new policy will be based on the four words starting with *por pla*, namely *prongsai* (transparency), *prayad* (economy), *prasitiparb* (efficiency) and *pentham* (justice).

Important issues will emphasize economic sustainability, good living and social harmony, and how to instill democratic principles in society. Under the general principles of the 10<sup>th</sup> National Development Plan, the people are to be as one.

However, we have to look at the main policy principles in detail. These comprise strategies in several different areas, such as administrative and political reform, economics, social and foreign affairs, and state security.

Nevertheless, I will emphasize the four *por* as the prime minister has mentioned and follow HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej's guidelines on sufficiency economy. There is a detailed policy manual to be released, and I will provide more information after I come back from Bangkok.

The "CEO Governor" title will be changed to reflect a more integrated role, but in large part the change is in name only; whatever the exact title given, the Governor is still the Gov-

ernor...Even though there are only three *amphur* [districts] in Phuket, the Governor here is responsible for a lot. That's why a great deal of organization is needed, with delegation of work on some principle policy issues to my deputies and other subordinates. We will work as a team and help each other; I can't do it all alone.

In terms of economic development, we have to look at both the past and the future. We certainly cannot afford to ignore the needs of our all-important tourism sector. We need to focus on the continual development of our tourism resources, including our beach and marine leisure facilities and unique cultural heritage.

We need to support our vision for a better Phuket, both in terms of policy and in actual practice. To support small entrepreneurs in the tourism sector and ensure standards are maintained, we plan to apply the principles of sufficiency economy.

Phuket has progressed further than other tourism provinces due to our past development strategies, which foresaw the island's development into a world-class international tourism destination.

Now we have to maintain our standards and have quality marketing.

When we go for a roadshow to promote the island in a foreign country, we should promote not only the standard attractions, but also its emergence as a hub for spa treatments, information technology and high-quality but reasonably priced medical services, including dentistry.

Thais are are service minded and very good at hospitality, which is why we have been successful at attracting tourists. There are several more countries that we want to establish sister city relationships with towns in Russia, China and Scandinavia. Overall our approach appears to be working, as we can see with more airlines establishing direct routes to Phuket.

Recently there have been complaints about the price of beach chairs in Patong. I have asked the district look into and deal with this issue.

Also, tuk-tuks sometimes charge tourists 500 baht just to go over the hill, which is an unreasonable price that will only hurt the drivers in the long term because it destroys our reputation among tourists.

There should also be standards in terms of food pricing and quality.

The province also hears complaints about overpriced seafood at tourist-oriented venues that is not only poor quality, but actually makes people sick.

The demographic landscape of Phuket is changing. There are many people coming to live here from other parts of Thailand and well as from abroad – including some who come here without the correct travel documents and work without permission, which is improper.

Among my many priority issues are reducing road accidents, improving water supply resources, environmental protection, cracking down on illegal foreign labor, improving the road network and other infrastructure.

I also want to improve security on the island by lobbying for an increase to the Phuket Provincial Police budget, which is currently based on the registered population and is therefore insufficient given the the number of people who actually live on the island, not to mention all the visitors that come here.

With the high season now

here, security for tourists is particularly important. I would like both the government and private sector to keep an eye out for them, refrain from taking advantage of them and to smile and be friendly.

At first I did not think the government would keep me in the province. I have already been working here for five years, which is long time to be assigned to one province for a deputy governor; normally deputy governors are rotated out of a province after just a few years.

However, I think my experience here and work capabilities will serve to benefit government plans for the province. I appreciate the Phuket of people encouraging my work here. I am always willing and happy to work here.

There are so many issues I would like address: disciplinary regulations, social problems, population registration, road accidents, traffic, safety standards, a disaster early-warning system and emergency evacuation preparedness, environment, garbage, water treatment.

We also need to work on ways of informing foreigner residents of our rules and regulations – along with the disciplinary measures taken for failure to comply. We should promote the rules, helping them become legal from the outset in such matters as investment and joint partnership investment

I would like to thank all Phuket residents and friends who have encouraged me, allowing me to learn and benefit from experiences that would not have been possible working anywhere else.

We are trying to make Phuket a better place to live, work and visit – and I believe everyone has a role to play in making that goal become a reality.

# Sound progress at the pound

I last visited the government dog pound, which was officially named the Mid Road Dog Shelter. My last visit was a depressing experience. Miserable, diseased dogs, inadequate staff and so on.

The Gazette reported in October that the Soi Dog Foundation (SDF) had moved in there, prompting me to visit again, and I have to say that the transformation is remarkable.

Although building work continues, the place looks clean, the dogs healthy and, most importantly, happy in their surroundings.

The center has now been renamed the Phuket Dog Shelter Rehoming Center, and I spoke to SDF's man-

ager Ina Pietschmann about what sures for different types of dogs, had been done to affect such a

managed to make such a big improvement in such a short period of time?

**Ina:** Obviously improving the facilities has been important, but the main thing is our staff and volunteers. Previously there were only a couple of workers here. They had time to do only basic feeding and cleaning. Now we are able to spend time with the dogs, which means sick and diseased animals can be separated and treated and dogs that don't get on with other dogs can be segregated, and so on.

We have also been able to clean the whole place up and create a pleasant environment for the dogs. As a result they are much happier.

**Top Dog:** Have you had good cooperation with the Phuket Provincial Livestock Office (PPLO)?

Ina: Very much so, Dr Sunart Wongvorachart, the head

t has been some time since of the PPLO, has given us a virtual free hand, as he is keen to improve the lives of the animals. We have also been promised the services of a government vet two days a week once our clinic is complete.

> Top Dog: What building work is currently going on?

> **Ina:** We are extending the shelters and making them more weatherproof so the dogs are better protected from the elements. We have made the fences taller, as dogs could escape before and would inevitably end up on the road, which was a danger

for both them and motorists.

Some of the compounds are being divided to enable us to provide separate enclo-

such as elderly dogs, puppies and aggressive dogs.

We are building a purpose-**Top Dog:** How have you built clinic and addressing other problems we have found. For example, in heavy rain, one enclosure would be inundated with up to 12 inches of water, so we are installing improved drainage

> **Top Dog:** When will this work be completed?

> Ina: That depends on donations. Companies and individuals are donating money and materials via our president, Dr Prasit Koeysiripong, but we can do only what we can afford to do, so we are addressing the most important issues first.

**Top Dog:** How many dogs are here now?

**Ina:** There are about 350 dogs here. Our main aim is to find homes for as many as possible. Some will spend the rest of their lives here, but the vast majority of these dogs – from large breeds to toy poodles - would make excellent family pets.

**Top Dog:** Where do so many dogs come from?

Ina: Some are here as a result of roundups by the government, some have been abandoned here and at our old center.

Some of the dogs we rescued from abuse and cruelty, and others required such long-term treatment that it was not possible to return them to where they originally came from as they would no longer be accepted by other dogs.

Top Dog: Do you practice euthanasia here?

**Ina:** Euthanasia is not approved of in Thailand, but our vets will put down dogs that are suffering and have no chance of recovery, and dogs that are genuinely aggressive, though such cases are very rare here.

**Top Dog:** How does the new shelter affect the SDF's sterilization program?

**Ina:** We have already ster-

ilized over 14,500 cats and dogs [since the program began] and have passed our target of 5,000 dogs this year.

From studies we have done in sample areas, we know that the number of stray dogs on the island has fallen substantially over the past three years. This confirms what many long-term residents and repeat visitors tell us.

Also, the dogs still on the streets are in better condition. Although we still see dogs in terrible condition it is the exception rather than the norm.

As tsunami-based funding comes to an end though, we are having to cut back on the number of sterilizations we do each month.

However, by cooperating with other organizations on the island such as the Phuket Animal Welfare Society, hopefully we will be able to complete what we all set out to do, which is to see an end to stray dogs on the is-

**Top Dog:** What are the biggest problems you face in achieving this?

**Ina:** There are three main issues, one of course is funding. In reality, at present we get very little funding from Phuket directly. A recent donation of 1 million baht from long-time local resident Walter Hoffman is an exception. Virtually all our funding comes from overseas. We need to raise more funds locally to complete the

Although we receive many complaints about dogs from hotels and individuals, very few are prepared to help financially in solving the problem. We receive no government funding, everything is done through donations.

The second major problem is the number of puppies being bred here, as well as being brought onto the island. Many people are breeding dogs to make money. Advertisements for all sorts of breeds of dog appear all over and puppies can be found for sale in many local markets.

Unfortunately, most of these breeders do not care about the dogs. Any unsold puppies are simply dumped at temples or even on the roadside.

The thrid problem is that there are still many people who allow their female dogs to have puppies, and then again dump the puppies after they are born, often when only a few days old.

It is up to us to find these dogs and persuade the owners to let us sterilize them.

We can do nothing about the breeders, but we hope that the government will introduce legislation allowing only licensed breeders to sell puppies. Sadly, many of the pedigree dogs advertised here are poor quality and carry inbred faults.

## Internet Explorer 7 versus Firefox

I just downloaded and installed Internet Explorer 7 (IE 7), and I can't seem to find my "Favorites". I used that for most of my Internet activity. Is it there under a different name? Also, is there any way to get IE 7 to do a "refresh"?

Microsoft has hidden the menus – the line that says File | Edit | View, ... Help – in IE 7. You can get your menus back by clicking the Tools icon and putting a check mark next to the line that says "Menu Bar". That brings the Favorite menu back up to the top, where the web gods ordained it should go.

If you're feeling more adventurous, you can find your Favorites in their new location. Click the yellow star to the left of the tabs (see picture). IE 7 presents your list of Favorites. I readily admit that I far prefer the old Favorites menu.

IE 7's "refresh" icon is a pair of up-and-down arrows, to the right of the address her and just before the Eirefox is

address bar, and just before the red "X" Stop button.

Now that I've explained the new icons in IE 7, let me take a moment to emphasize a point that bears repeating: I don't use Internet Explorer, and I strongly recommend that you don't either.

In its first two weeks of existence, security folks found four – count 'em, four – security holes in IE 7. This from a supposedly super-secure browser, Microsoft's flagship web product.

Two of the holes amounted to little more than parlor tricks, but the other two struck right at the heart of IE 7 and Windows.

thing called ActiveX. Internet Explorer 6 and 7 both allow ActiveX programs to run. Malicious websites hitch a ride on Active X and clobber Windows. You should set IE 7 so it doesn't run ActiveX programs – see www.askwoody.com/news comments.php?newsid=694. But even so, Internet Explorer has all sorts of old security problems lurking.


Everybody – let me repeat that, for emphasis – everybody should download and install IE 7. But nobody – nobody – should use Internet Explorer unless there's a huge pressing need to run it. (Yes, I know, some sites only work with Internet Explorer.)

You should download, install, learn and use Firefox 2 (getfirefox.com). You can read a raft of reviews that will explain in picayune detail why Firefox 2 is a better browser than IE 7, but there's one overwhelming fact: Firefox has way, way fewer se-

curity problems. Why? Because Firefox doesn't and won't run ActiveX programs.

Firefox is a wonderful product. It's fast. It's stable. It coexists with Internet Explorer, no problem at all. It's free. It's open source. (Yes, I know that the current government's ICT Minister doesn't believe in open source. Wonder if he's ever tried Firefox?) It's fixed quickly and competently. Most of all, it's not Microsoft.

In the past six months, I've written about 1,200 pages of Dummies books on Windows Vista. Every time I mention Internet Explorer, I also mention Firefox, usually in the same sentence. Firefox is the wave of the future. The only people who write

books about Internet Explorer any more are the ones working for Microsoft. Okay, I'm exaggerating. But only a little bit.

Microsoft's CEO Steve Ballmer has been quoted saying that everyone who runs Linux (except SuSE Linux) owes Microsoft money and that companies running Linux have an undisclosed liability on their balance sheet. Is it true that Linux infringes on Microsoft's patents?

What a crock. Linux is the free, open-source operating system that strives to compete with Windows. Most people are much better off with Windows, but Linux is a great alternative.

Ballmer cut a deal with Novell, which distributes and supports (for a fee) a version of Linux called SuSE. Microsoft gave Novell \$348 million for "get SuSE free" coupons that Microsoft may or may not hand out to customers. Novell gave \$40 million back

to Microsoft for reasons that are currently the subject of heated debate. Both parties signed agreements not to sue each other for patent infringements.

Two weeks later, Ballmer publicly stated that anyone who runs a version of Linux other than SuSE Linux owes Microsoft money, presumably because of as-yet-undefined patent infringements in all versions of Linux. Ballmer says that the \$40 million Novell payment was to cover patent issues.

Novell CEO Ron Hovsepain released an open letter that says, in part, "We disagree with the recent statements made by Microsoft on the topic of Linux and patents. Importantly, our agreement with Microsoft is in no way an acknowledgment that Linux infringes upon any Microsoft intellectual property. When we entered the patent cooperation agreement with Microsoft, Novell did not agree or admit that Linux or any other Novell offering violates Microsoft patents."

But, of course, Microsoft

made sure that the agreement included a payment that certainly could be interpreted as a patent pay-off. In the end, it makes Novell look stupid, which was certainly one of Microsoft's goals in the first place.

It's clear to me that Microsoft wants to clobber the popular Red Hat version of Linux, and doesn't care who it has to deal with to get that done. Microsoft's done that before, partnering with unlikely bedmates, weakening a relatively strong rival, then turning on the partner like a black widow.



## Stable returns – an investor's choice

accusing me of referring too frequently to two topics: hedge funds and Brandeaux, a fund-management company. In an effort to answer those complaints, I examined my own work.

have received complaints ences – often as little as one paragraph – to hedge funds, which hardly marks me out as a promoter for the whole industry.

> Here are some examples. From the July 29, 2006, issue, while commenting on commodity prices, I wrote, "The reality is that many hedge funds were making excellent profits earlier this year on rising commodity prices. When commodity prices fell, so did the majority of hedge

'hedge funds' and had aggressively moved into long positions."

In another article I quoted Alan Greenspan's comment on hedge funds: "They have appeared to have picked all the lower hanging fruit."

In the same article I quoted Steve Forbes, the publisher of Forbes Magazine. During a television interview, he stated that there are around 8,500 hedge funds in the US, adding that he doubted that there are enough brains to manage them all.

In a different article on General Motors, published almost two years ago, I briefly mentioned hedge funds and the effect on them by the entry of Kirk Kerkorian as major shareholder in GM by saying, "The hedge funds suddenly faced sharp losses and the true situation will take some time to be known."

I also wrote about AMT Futures IQS Fund, but noted, "It is not for widows and orphans or those of a nervous disposition. The fund should ideally form only a small percentage of any investment portfolio." In another arti-

funds. They forgot they were cle I wrote "hedge funds are hideously expensive entities when the fee structure is examined."

> Turning to Brandeaux in the same 100 articles, I have written about Brandeaux four times. One of the articles was, in fact, not about Brandeaux, except to

counter any impression that I favored groups like Brandeaux and Orbis because I received commission from them. I pointed out that neither Brandeaux nor Orbis pay commission to anyone, never have and probably never will.

I have supported both groups and others because they are very good

at what they do. I have no fixed connection to any asset manager. In fact, all of my business is via insurance companies; I use them as a platform to hold assets and simply give them a shopping list of what funds to buy.

Brandeaux does not deal directly with the public, myself or any other financial intermediary. It deals only with financial institutions.

Orbis, on the other hand, deals directly with the public. They charge no entry or exit fees, only management fees. However, Orbis closed for all new busi-

> ness on March 17, and have still not reopened, they will only deal with existing clients.

I have also received complaints that I have been isolated in Phuket for far too long and fail to report objectively on hedge funds, particularly Amaranth Advisers.



The cause of Amaranth's problems were simple: they took huge, long, leveraged positions. In other words, they took investors' cash and borrowed extra to invest in natural gas prices. A long position means they were betting on the price ris-


They misread the market; the price of natural gas fell. Instead of abandoning the position, Amaranth held on until they lost about 65% of investors' money in a matter of weeks.

That is why, among other reasons, I wrote for anyone contemplating investing in hedge funds, "to access this 'brave new world' requires a lot of research. One tip: Look at the managers, what experience do they have and what is their track record?"

Why do I like Brandeaux? Because they deliver what they promise, usually more, and not one of their funds has ever fallen in price. Like most investors, I value stability and they have consistently delivered returns far in excess of cash or bonds.

Also, they once bought me lunch – although I had been dealing with them for more than nine years by that stage.


### Bondi top Soccer 7s 'Masters'

# Rawai Beach makeover underway

RAWAI: Rawai Tambon Administration Organization (OrBor-*Tor*) is constructing a new pier and implementing a beach beautification project in an attempt to draw more tourists to the Rawai

Rawai OrBorTor President Aroon Solos told the Gazette that among the new developments will be a new pier, with the hope that it will become a tourist attraction.

"Ten years ago we used to have an old wooden pier about 100 meters long and 2m wide, but it became delapidated over time.

"That pier was used for sightseeing by tourists who stopped here on their way to Laem Phromthep, and while they were here they also went shopping at the pearl shops around Rawai beach. The pier was also used for mooring by the fishermen," he said.

K. Aroon said that Rawai residents requested that he build another pier to take its place.

tourism in Rawai. Many pearl shops, seafood restaurants and even the sea gypsy villagers will benefit from the tourists' spending money here. It will also decrease the crowd at Chalong Pier when people want to take boats to other islands," he said.

The new concrete pier, 333m long and 4m wide, will stretch out into the sea beside the sea gypsy village. The pier has been under construction since June of this year and is due to be completed in June of next year.

The pier will be T-shaped, with three branches from each side to create about 50 mooring spaces. Each branch will be 24m in length.

The budget of 48.7 million baht came from different sources: 37.9 million baht was allocated by the Governor's discretionary budget, and about 11 million baht was supplied by the Japanese govern-

rehabilitate the tsunami-affected areas. As Rawai was hit by tsunami, we got some of the funds," he said.

"We will also have two rest areas on the bridge, which will have a roof and some seats for people sightseeing or waiting for boats. Cars will not be allowed to drive on this pier, except in emergency situations," he added.

The beach beautification project is under construction with a separate budget of 11 million baht, and will include repairs on the 300m-long dike in front of Mae Klong and Salaloy Seafood

The project will also include construction of an 800m-long walkway along Rawai Beach to Pak Bang Beach, as well as street lights, a parking lot and 14 stalls at Pak Bang Beach.

"We want the beach to be empty of the ropes used for mooring boats, and we are waiting for the 43 million baht budget in order to dredge Klong Pak Bang to moor longtail boats.

"The new area for longtail boats will be good place for them to avoid storm winds and it will make the beach clear and clean as well," K. Aroon said.

"We will make Rawai


Beach suitable for swimming, and aside from organizing boats' mooring, we will also move the food vendors to the new stalls at Pak Bang beach, leaving only 14 food vendors on Rawai Beach.


"We will also take care of the environment and keep the beach clean to make it more attractive to tourists," he said.

"Our project next year, in addition to dredging Klong Pak Bang, is to clean up and improve the landscaping at Laem Phromthep," K. Aroon added.


The beach beautification project will be finished in March of next year.







wo local ladies who have made a name for them selves in designing and creating contemporary and functional ceramics are sisters Namfon and Chernporn Kanjanasaya of Ceramics of Phuket. Their innovative creations reflect artistic flair at every turn.

K. Namfon and K. Chernporn use their own blend of "Phuket clay", a compound of high-grade molding clay mixed with Phuket tin, which they say preserves each piece's natural beauty with its texture and natural tone.

They also use imaginative blends of color, which General Manager Torwong Kanjanasaya says are inspired by the natural emerald green and blue hues of the Andaman Sea and the fresh tones of the nearby coral reefs.

The ladies' creations are on display at several hotels in Phuket, including the Banyan Tree Phuket and the Hilton Phuket Arcadia Resort & Spa, as well as several hotels and restaurants abroad, in places such as Hong Kong, Brazil and Singapore.


tage in the long run. It made us more creative and willing to try different things. We weren't limited by a lot of preconceived ideas," K. Chernporn said.

### Gardening

hat is a bleeding heart exactly? To be honest, I didn't really have a clue until I asked a few Americans. It does seem to me to be a bit of a silly expression; yet another phrase that our transatlantic cousins have created for no particular reason, not really knowing why. They do appear to refer to "bleeding heart liberals" a lot, though.

To me, any kind of Liberal (with a capital "L") is a bloke in a tweed suit who is just unsure whether to go with the Tories or Labour, pounding the streets of sunny England doing his best to convince the populace to vote for him in the upcoming election; a kind of Monty Pythonesque character. Then again, I'm a Brit, so what do I know.

My dictionary defines someone with a bleeding heart as a "foolishly soft-hearted person, or somebody regarded as naively kind or sympathetic towards those who claim to be underprivileged or exploited". I'm not sure what that means, and I'm not even sure if it's a good thing or

tics, I'm really not sure that they are. It would appear that you can have forms of BHLs on both sides of the political fence, but being called one by the other side isn't exactly complimentary.

I could have a rant here about "the nonsense that these bleeding heart liberals espouse" but then things get all intense, and people start accusing each other of all sorts of wrongdoings just because of their political view. Hang on a minute, I'm actually getting serious.

In that case, it's time for the inevitable, gratuitous, unwarranted attack on Americans. Why on earth do they all think that we Brits are best mates with the queen, and why do they do their very best to imitate an "English" accent, only to suffer the fate of



sounding exactly like Dick Van Dyke? Gratuitous attack over sorry about that. Back to the bleeding hearts.

This is a gardening column after all, supposedly. It's about gardening rather than political systems. How about the bleeding heart vine then? You must have seen this one coming from a long way off.

Its alternative names, the glorybower or clerodendrum, aren't quite as interesting, and make about as much sense. Thais know this common vine as the mangkon-khaap-kaew. Before anyone writes to me to say that I've got the name completely wrong, which I probably have, I think it applies to the type of clerodendrum with small splashes of red that appear from the center of bright white flowers. The one in the picture is the red version of the same plant.

In both versions, the clerodendrum thomsoniae (the white one) and clerodendrum splendens (red), the flowers appear almost continuously in sprays, or calyces, about the size of a ten-

The plant's growth rate is similar to that of a hormonal teenager. It can go through periods when nothing much happens, then without warning, an unexpected growth spurt can occur. The rate of growth can be mental at times, sending out tendrils in all directions.

During periods when it seems that every day another inch has been added to the ever-extending reach of the shoots, like a teenager, they need a fair bit of pointing in the right direction. The method of dealing with them is to tie them to a trellis, nails in a wall, or something similar to give them a little assistance during that difficult time. Not the ideal solution for a 15-year-old perhaps.

The bleeding heart vine is happiest in dry conditions, and shouldn't be over-watered. Ideally, the soil should be welldrained and rich in organic material. In Phuket, good drainage in the soil isn't usually a problem, but the organic material side will probably need a little help. When planting it in the garden, make sure it's surrounded by some of that compost you buy in those small white sacks from any garden center. That's all it needs.

It will tolerate full sun with adequate moisture, but prefers partial shade. Like many plants in this part of the world, it will

tolerate conditions that aren't perfect, but will give you the plant equivalent of a cheesy grin if it's treated well. They need protection from strong winds too.

Don't worry if parts of the plant seem to give up the ghost at times. After blooming, it's perfectly normal for that part of the plant to die back.

This is another one that can be propagated with cuttings. A few years ago, I was doing a little gardening after one or two polite beers. Well, perhaps more than one or two. Anyway, I was pruning away at a bleeding heart vine, cutting off those old tendrils that had long since shed their flowers and leaves.

One that looked a little bare at the base also deserved this treatment, until I pulled it away and realized that everything was very much alive further up the 6 foot stem. Normally a cutting of this size would be far too long to take root, as all the action was going on too far away from the

In my somewhat fuzzy state, I ignored this fact, and stuck it into the soil anyway, almost pretending that nobody would notice, and cracked open another beer. Far from withering and doing what my foolish act deserved, the cutting actually took root and eventually flourished as a whole new plant. These things are tough.

You can pick up a small bleeding heart vine at your local garden center for as little as 50 baht - not exactly the most expensive of garden purchases. Little effort is required to keep them going, and the plant can be kept in a pot or deposited in the garden.

It's probably a bit on the cheap side for American politicians though. They'd rather spend a few million on flags, balloons and marching bands. Having said that, why couldn't it become a symbol for some American politicians? If you think your political opponent is a "foolishly soft-hearted person", send him a plant. That could work.
