Bombs spark security alert

PHUKET: Police Region 8 put 50 extra officers on standby in Phuket over the holiday period, to be bolstered by about 100 more officers on standby from January 5, following the bomb blasts in Bangkok on New Year's Eve.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pol Maj Gen Decha Budnampeth told the *Gazette* that the extra officers, to remain in Phuket until the end of the high season, will be divided among the island's eight police stations.

"We are focusing the extra security mostly at popular tourism areas, such as Patong and at other beaches. We were lucky that this year nothing bad happened and there were lots of tourists," he said.

Gen Decha said that the Bangkok bombings were unrelated to the ongoing violence in the Deep South.

The bombs were meant to cause a disturbance rather than maximize carnage, he said.

He called on the public to help with the security effort. "If anyone sees anything suspicious they should report it as soon as possible by calling 191," he added.

However, tourism industry experts remain cautiously optimistic that the bombings in Bangkok will have limited impact on tourism numbers in Phuket.

Suwalai Pinpradab, Director of Tourism Authority of Thailand's Southern Region 4 office in Phuket, said, "We are concerned about this in Phuket, especially as it comes during a peak period for tourism.

"If similar incidents occur and the violence continues to

spread, we could face problems here."

Foreign embassies, including those of Australia, New Zealand, England and the US, issued warnings advising their nationals to exercise caution while traveling in Bangkok, she

"However, I have yet to receive reports of tourists canceling plans to visit Phuket," she said on January 2.

"If this string of bombings turns out to be an isolated incident, I think tourism prospects for 2007 remain very good. I have spoken to several hotel operators and they have told me business is very good at the moment," said K. Suwalai.

Phuket Tourist Association (PTA) President Maitree Narukatpichai told the *Gazette* two days after the blasts that there had been no impact on bookings

at the Hilton Phuket Arcadia Resort & Spa in Karon, where he is Owner's Representative.

"I haven't checked with other hotels yet, but nothing has changed at my hotel. However, this is bound to have some impact on the industry, as security is very important to tourists. Reports about the bombings in the international media will damage the entire country's reputation, especially coming in the wake of a military coup," he said.

Despite his concerns, K. Maitree expects 2007 tourist arrival figures to match the estimated 4.8 million visitors who came to Phuket in 2006, provided there are no more threats to security.

Deputy Patong Mayor Chairat Sukaban said there would be little short-term impact on tourism, but that such events Continued on page 2

Boy, 15, blasted with shotgun

PHUKET CITY: Piyawuth "Ab" Pattamapaneewong, 19, and Wirat "Dam" Thongsu, 20, both from Phuket City, have been charged with gunning down a 15-year-old boy about 12:30 am on December 24.

The victim was identified as Chumphon "Toto" Ruengdam, son of Prasert "Phu Yai Soi" Ruengdam, Headman of Rassada Village 3.

Police arrested the two suspects about 5 am the same day in a rented room on Samkong Rd, where they were sleeping soundly. Police found a shotgun along with four unused cartridges and a fifth spent cartridge behind the headboard of the bed.

The officer in charge of the case, who asked to remain anonymous, said that Chumphon was riding around Phuket City with six to eight friends, when he saw Ab and Dam at the Clock Tower traffic circle.

Ab and Dam were allegedly incensed by Chumphon staring at them, and followed him to Satree Phuket School intersection, where Ab pulled out a sawed-off shotgun from his waistband and hit Chumphon twice over the head with it.

Dam sped away, but as he did so Ab fired at Chumphon, riddling his body with nine pellets.

Chumphon managed to hold on to his friend for 200 meters or so after being shot, but then fell to the roadway and died.

The two suspects have been charged with murder and unlawful possession of a firearm.

can have long-term effects that are not reflected by cancellations. Tourists might choose not to book in the first place if they feel Phuket is unsafe, he said.

"They may choose another country, such as Vietnam, if they think it is safer," K. Chairat said.

To minimize the chance of a bombing in Phuket, he called on homeowners and business operators to cooperate by waiting until just before scheduled garbage collection times to put out their trash, especially in tourist areas.

"If everyone cooperates, tourist areas can be more secure and more attractive," he said.

Along Soi Bangla in Patong, for example, garbage is now collected every two hours due to security concerns and large garbage bins have been replaced by smaller ones.

Security concerns about the heart of Patong's red light district have been high ever since the October 2002 bombing in Bali.

Niphon Piromrit, Secretary of the Phuket Limousine and Business Services Cooperative (PBC), told the Gazette that all PBC members are keeping an eye out for threats to security, especially at the airport. "We will remain alert and if we see anything suspicious we will report it to airport security," he said.

"I believe whoever did it was just trying to stir up trouble and didn't mean to kill anyone," he said.

Three die in New Year's Day road accidents

PHUKET: Between the end of the new year countdown and sunrise on New Year's Day, three people were killed on Phuket roads.

The first fatality of the year on the island's roads came at 2:30 am, when Suripong Jitsamut. 30, was killed when his motorbike crashed into an electricity pylon.

At 3:35 am, Prakarn Keawdee, 20, and Thanachart Rungsrisuk, 18, were killed after their motorbike was involved in a collision with another

From December 28 to the end of January 1, 26 people had been injured in road accidents.

The Governor had earlier set a target of limiting road deaths to three and injuries on the road below 40 over the December 28 to January 3 holiday period.

Police reported that they had stopped 39,286 drivers and handed out 2,119 tickets between December 28 and January 1.

The most common offense was driving without a license, for which 1,134 tickets were issued. Not wearing a helmet on a motorbike was the second with 586 tickets, while 247 drivers and passengers were ticketed for not wearing a seat belt. Eighty-five people were caught with illegally-modified motorbikes.

Another 67 tickets were issued for drunk driving, but no drivers were cited for speeding.

At 7:30 pm December 27, the evening before the "danger period" began, three men died after the pickup in which they were riding as passengers on the back seat overshot a curve and slammed into a power pole in Mai Khao.

Princesses to visit Phuket

PHUKET: HRH Princess Chulabhorn Mahidol and HRH Princess Bajrakitiyabha will visit Phuket this month.

Princess Chulabhorn will arrive at Phuket International Airport January 8, staying at the Similan Islands off Phang Nga until January 14.

Princess Bajrakitiyabha will arrive in Phuket January 18. As part of her work with the Justice Ministry, she will visit the Phuket State Attorney's Office on the morning of January 19 and will stay at Hilton Phuket Arcadia Resort. She will leave the island January 20.

The visits of HRHs Chulabhorn and Bajrakitiyabha follow HRH Princess Soamsavali arriving on the island December 28 and staying at the Banyan Tree Phuket for two nights.

During her visit, Princess Soamsavali presided over the opening ceremony of a tsunami evacuation site at Wat Panasnikom in Baan Bang Niang in Phang Nga.

Fake Mah Song jailed for 15 days

THALANG: Medium Paitoon Khopwej, 27, a woodcarver from Chalong, has served 15 days as a guest at Baan Bang Jo prison for "deceiving the public" after skewering a pig's tongue instead of his own during this year's Vegetarian Festival.

Paitoon took part in the festival as a mah song ("spirit medium"). However, he pretended to skewer his tongue with a sword, but in fact ran the blade through a pig's tongue that he had put in his mouth to fool onlook-

He told police he wanted to impress the crowds by skewering his tongue bottom-to-top with both a long, pointed sword and a sharp-tipped saw blade – but that he was too afraid of the pain.

When his deception was discovered, Paitoon was beaten by an angry mob and reported to elders at Kathu Chinese Shrine, who then filed a complaint against him with Tung Tong police.

B10,000 reward for escaped convict

PHUKET CITY: The Director of Phuket Provincial Prison is offering a 10,000-baht reward for information leading to the arrest of a convict who broke out of Phuket Provincial Prison in December and remains at-large.

Phuket Provincial Prison Director Paisal Suwanraksa identified the fugitive as Thiwa Wahji,

In his successful bid for freedom on February 18, Thiwa

scaled the facility's wall by using a homemade rope made from shoelaces, he said.

K. Paisal reported the breakout to Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit at the annual meeting of the Phuket Provincial Security Committee held at Provincial Hall.

Thiwa was being held at the prison for four theft-related crimes, including two snatch-andrun crimes in Thalang for which he had already been convicted and sentenced to a total of seven years in prison, K. Paisal said.

Two other court cases are pending against Thiwa, one a snatch-and-run and the other a burglary, he added.

"He served more than one year at the prison and I believe he is still somewhere in the province," K. Paisal said.

"As we have searched for him everywhere without success, I am happy to give a 10,000-baht reward out of my own pocket to anyone who can tell us where he is," said K. Paisal.

K. Paisal said having Thiwa on the loose was a threat to public safety, given his criminal record.

The search for the fugitive has thus far focused on where he is know to have relatives and close friends, including sites in Krabi, Pattani, Phattalung, Phang Nga, Chumphon and Nakorn Sri Thammarat provinces.

K. Paisal said Thiwa escaped where a prison building was close to a wall, enabling him to scale the fence and flee. The "weak spot" in the prison's containment will be rectified, he said.

Health Chief warns of 'unhealthy' foreign labor

PHUKET: Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) Chief Dr Wanchai Sattayawuthipong has warned that the large number of illegal migrant workers on Phuket is placing the island's population at greater risk of an outbreak of communicable diseases.

Dr Wanchai's warning follows an order from the Ministry of Public Health in Bangkok to crack down on communicable diseases by targeting foreign laborers in order to prevent diseases from entering or spreading throughout the country.

However, he said that the PPHO already screens incoming migrant workers as part of the registration process, and that for the past two to three years the PPHO has been tracking and recording details of foreign labor-

Visitor co-ordinator Nuch Nulong said that the Life Home Project had outgrown its previous rented location. The new facilities are larger and the project was able to buy it, K. Nuch said.

In that time, he said, the PPHO has found that the number of foreign laborers in Phuket with HIV or tuberculosis has increased

In 2004 the PPHO found that 38 migrant workers had HIV, but that in 2005 the number had grown to 46.

Other communicable ailments commonly suffered by Thai and foreign laborers on the island are diarrhea, gastrointestinal diseases, pneumonia and skin diseases, he added.

Malaria among foreign laborers is another main concern of the PPHO, said Dr Wanchai, as it had not been found on the island until the use of foreign laborers increased around 1998.

He said that Phuket currently has about 30,000 legal foreign laborers, but that the total number of migrant workers on the island may be closer to 60,000 or 70,000.

"People should not support illegal foreign laborers working in Phuket. If Phuket people do not allow foreign laborers to come in, that would help to reduce the incidence of communicable diseases in Phuket," he said.

'Chalong bomber' remains at large

PHUKET CITY: A high-level provincial panel investigating bomb attacks in November on three new homes off Chao Fa East Rd and a land dispute in the area has made little progress, despite the Governor's insistence that those responsible be brought to justice as soon as possible.

Meanwhile, home construction continues in the area, part of which may be protected mangrove forest.

Chalong Police Deputy Superintendent Pol Lt Col Suwat Kaewprom said that police have prepared a list of key witnesses and have substantial physical evidence, including the fingerprints and a police sketch of the suspected bomber.

The suspect remains at large however, Col Suwat told other members of the Phuket Provincial Security Committee at the group's monthly meeting at the Thavorn Grand Plaza Hotel December 27.

Noting that the three damaged homes were being repaired and that construction of another new home had begun, he urged fellow panel members to move as quickly as possible in ruling on the status of the land, which is subject to an ownership dispute.

Committee member Muang District Chief Wirawat Janpen said that his office had conducted a survey that found 123 families living on the land in dispute. It would take about two more weeks for the panel to conclude whether or not some of the land occupied is mangrove forest, he said.

Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit urged all committee members to conclude their parts of the investigation as soon as possible, saying that encroachment issues are one of the island's most pressing problems

Young man executed at Layan

THALANG: A young angler was found shot in the back of the head on a bridge at Layan Beach on December 28.

Pol Lt Col Jessada Sangsuree, Investigating Inspector at Cherng Talay Police Station, told the *Gazette* that Suthin Srisamut, 40, about 10:30 pm that night reported that the body of his son, Worayuth Srisamut, 25, had been discovered on the bridge.

He said that Worayuth was found dead with his fishing rod and two empty cans of Leo beer

next to him. He had been shot in the back of the skull with a .38caliber gun.

The body was sent to Thalang Hospital for forensic testing.

Col Jessada said that Worayuth's wife had told police that Worayuth had been worried about something, but had not confided in her before taking his fishing rod to the bridge, Col Jessada said

Police believe that gang involvement or mistaken identity were likely factors in the murder.














CHICK OR CHEAT?

PATONG: A front-page headline in the December 30 edition of a daily Thai-language newspaper shocked readers with the horrific news that a mother had murdered her newborn child and left its lifeless corpse to rot in a field behind a row of low-rent apartments.

The headline for the initial report, roughly translated, read: "Wicked brutality: Mother kills child, stuffs in box."

The report featured a fuzzy picture of the "newborn", accompanied by the caption: State of the corpse of the newborn, killed by mother with the heart of an ogre. The corpse was found in a foam box, which was thrown behind a row flats belonging to bar girls and alien laborer during the middle of the night in Tambon Patong, Kathu District, Phuket Province.

The report said that the box was discovered at about 5:30 pm on December 28 by workers at the Damrongphan Wood shop, off Sainamyen Rd.

So bad was the state of the smell emanating from the box that police and workers with the Kusoldharm Volunteer Rescue Foundation were called in to investigate.

They took the box of rotting flesh to Patong Hospital, where it was photographed. The report read that the body of the "newborn" was so badly decomposed that doctors there found it impossible to determine its gender.

The report also quoted an unnamed source in the Kathu Police as saying that the newborn was probably born to either a bar girl or a poor alien worker who lacked the mental capacity to care for it, and therefore killed it, stuffed its remains into the box and threw it away.


When the *Gazette* called Kathu Police duty officer Pol Maj Pisit Chuenpet to confirm the gruesome details a different story emerged. The rotting flesh was discovered by workers as described, but it was unlikely the remains of a human baby, he said.


"I think that it looked more like a bag of rotten chicken than a dead baby. We only found a few bones, and they resembled those of a chicken leg. We didn't find a skull or anything else indicating it was human," he said.

"It would make no sense for someone to wrap a body up like that and leave it in a place where people could see it. It would be better for them to bury it and conceal the crime," he added.

"I do not want people to panic or say things that are not true. I remember a case, around the time when they first started building Jungceylon, when workers found something buried near the site. People thought it might be a dead body, so by the time we got there there were lots of people standing around, expecting to see a human corpse. But it turned out to be the bodies of four dogs that somebody had poisoned and buried there," he said.

Just to be on the safe side, the remains would be sent from the hospital to a police forensics laboratory for further examination, Maj Pisit said.

ccultist Harn "Nain Ae" Raksajit was sentenced to a total 100 years in prison after his conviction in 25 cases of sexual assault against women.

Harn will serve only 20 years out of the sentence, however, as that is the maximum combined prison term stipulated for crimes that carry a maximum sentence of no more than five years.


Harn, 46, managed to convince his victims that having sex with him would make them more attractive to men.

Harn asked clients to undress during his charm procedures and persuaded them to have sex with him, claiming this would make his magic more potent

The Criminal Court also ordered him to return a total of 910,000 baht to 33 women who paid him for improving their "charm" in this way.

Harn's wife, Chamaiphorn, is seeking a divorce after she became infected with a venereal disease she alleges her husband contracted from a client.

The one-time Buddhist novice was defrocked after he was discovered producing "magic potions" from stillborn infants, an offense for which he was con-

Water woes: Drinking water at almost two-thirds of schools in Thailand is substandard, according to random checks by the Medical Sciences Department.

Department Director-General Dr Paijit Warachit said that student health problems could arise from contaminated water sources, containers, coolers and filter machines found in 63% of the schools surveyed.

Conducted between March and August, the random checks covered 724 schools in various provinces.

The checks found large amounts of cadmium, lead, nitrate, manganese, aluminum, fluoride and micro-organisms in drinking water at many schools.

According to Dr Paijit, the chemicals could be harmful to the drinkers.

Too much manganese can cause fever, headaches, loss of appetite and weakened muscles. Too much iron could cause nausea and osteoporosis, he said.

Dr Paijit said the findings have been given to the relevant authorities, including the Education Ministry and schools.

Knocked up, locked up: Cabi-

net approved a proposal put forward by the National Human Rights Commission for legal amendments that would delay punishment for pregnant convicts by a few years.

The move aims to allow pregnant convicts to give birth and take care of newborns before being sent to jail.

There are now up to 130 pregnant women in Thai jails, said Angkhaneung Lebnak, Director of the Central Women's Correctional Institute.

Correctional facilities have doctors provide pre-natal care for pregnant detainees, who are sent to hospitals outside the prison when they go into labor.

The Corrections Department would also contact their relatives to get them to take care of the babies.

"If no relatives show up, we will take care of the children until they reach the age of six years old. After that, we will transfer them to the care of the Public Welfare Department," she said.

Some female detainees also got pregnant while in prison, Angkhaneung said.

he project to build an L-shaped private pier protected by a breakwater off Klong Son Beach has stirred up a great deal of controversy on Koh Yao Yai, where the headman of Baan Yamee has accused Prayad Srisamut, President of the Koh Yao Yai Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*), of deliberately concealing from villagers the fact that he had given written approval for the project at a provincial-level meeting as far back as last July.

The villagers learned that K. Prayad had approved the project only after a meeting at Phuket Rajabhat University on December 20. That meeting was attended by Vasant Panich, one of the 11 members of the National Human Rights Commission, which has taken up the villagers' fight on the grounds that the proposed pier and breakwater will infringe on their rights, mainly their means to make a living.

Commissioner Vasant's active interest in the issue is no small feat. High-profile human rights cases he has been involved with include the investigation into the disappearance of of human rights lawyer Somchai Neelaphaijit and the unsolved killings during the Thaksin administration's "War on Drugs".

Although the NHRC lacks the authority to directly punish or prosecute a guilty party, it has important oversight powers, including the rights to examine cases as it sees fit and report any human rights violations and make recommendations to both the National Legislative Assembly and the Cabinet.

The project, if it goes ahead, will be developed by Bangkok-based firm Naracha, part of the Nichada Group of Companies.

Koh Yao villagers

Construction of a pier and breakwater at Klong Son Beach on Koh Yao Yai is on hold as the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) seeks to have the project's building permit revoked, but the development firm behind the project says it has all the necessary authorization and plans to begin work early this year.

The *Gazette*'s **Sompratch Saowakhon** and **Stephen Fein** investigate the controversy, which has pitted Bangkok developers against poor local people – and left some local officials in hot water.

Col Pracha Yoosumran, who identified himself as a consultant to Naracha, told the *Gazette* that the planned pier will comprise a 15-meter main dock running off the beach and an L-shaped 70-meter floating dock running out into the sea, where it will be protected by a large breakwater. At 5.8 meters wide, the pier would be similar in appearance to docks at the Boat Lagoon in Phuket, he said.

Permission to construct the pier and breakwater has already been granted by the local office of the Marine Department, which has authorized dredging of the seabed to accommodate docking for boats of up to 20 tons displacement, he added.

"Naracha Company has already been granted all the necessary building permits by the local Marine Department office and we own more than 500 rai of land in the area, where we plan to develop a holiday home project," he said.

Col Pracha denied that any of the land in question was under investigation by the Department of Special Investigation, as has been reported by some Thai-language media sources.

The land has long been owned outright by Naracha and has no connection with land that is now the subject of an encroachment case involving Malaysianborn Phuket resident Tan Teik Hai, aka "Valentino", he said.

Dredging work and construction of the pier and construction of an offshore breakwater would begin in early 2007, he said.

However, opposition to the pier project is especially strong in Ban Yamee, a part of Koh Yao Yai's Village 3 area. Residents there fear the project will destroy the local marine environment on which many of them rely to make a living. There are also concerns that the project will destroy seagrass beds that sustain the local dugong population, which is already highly-endangered.



Local fisherfolk of Baan Yamee claim they stand to lose their livelihoods if the pier and breakwater are built.

The headman of Village 3, who asked for his name to be withheld, told the *Gazette* that about 400 people live in the immediate vicinity of the planned pier and that up to 40% of them rely directly on local marine resources for a living.

"Most of the people who live here are poor, including myself," he said.

Wannakiat Thubthimsang, Director of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MNRE) Department of Marine and Coastal Resources Phuket office, in October told the *Gazette* that his office had surveyed the area of the intended pier. At that time he confirmed the presence of both coral and seagrass beds in the area.

"In my opinion, any changes

to the seabed will have some impact on the local environment," he said.

He noted at that time, however, that the environmental impact of the work would depend both on the final project design and how the work was actually carried out.

Representatives from Naracha and the local Marine Department met briefly with Koh Yao Yai residents in early October, informing them about the project.

After that meeting, Naracha agreed to reduce the size of the pier and to install a breakwater in order to address villagers concerns about the environmental impact of the project, said the headman of Village 3.

Naracha claimed to have

won local support for the project, but this came from canvassing opinion of residents of villages 1, 2 and 4, whose livelihoods would not be directly affected by the project, said the headman.

However, Baan Yamee residents, whose livelihoods stand to be directly affected if the pier is built, remained adamantly opposed to any offshore construction.

To head off the project, they contacted the MNRE in Bangkok as well as the NHRC.

At a December 14 meeting between local residents and representatives of the Naracha

Company, officials from the local Marine Department office asked Naracha to delay construction, pending review and a decision by the Ministry of Transport in Bangkok.

Then on December 20, after the meeting at Rajabhat Phuket University and a visit to the proposed project site, K. Vasant told the *Gazette* in a phone interview that despite the building permit issued by the Transport Ministry's Marine Department, offshore construction in the area is prohibited by law.

The seabed off Klong Son

Beach is protected under legislation put in place after the tsunami. The legislation aims to protect natural barriers to impede any future tsunamis and to protect the rights of local residents who rely on marine and coastal resources, he explained.

In addition, the work would involve dredging some 100,000 tons of sediment. Naracha has not specified where this material would be stored or disposed of after its removal, he added.

K. Vasant said that his panel would send urgent requests to halt the project to both the MNRE and to the Ministry of Transport, which has the authority to revoke the building permit issued by its Marine Department.

In the meantime, it was agreed that the project be put on hold until both the MNRE and Transport Ministry review the project, he said.

On the morning of December 25, a group of about 30 villagers presented a petition to K. Prayad. The petition, which they asked him to sign and send directly to Naracha, noted their opposition to the project – and by his signature, his.

"After the big meeting between Naracha company's representatives and the NHRC at Rajabhat Phuket University on December 20, it was decided to postpone the project," said the Village 3 headman.

But on that day, the Ban Yamee villagers learned for the first time that in fact the OrBor-*Tor* President had already signed off his permission for the Naracha project on July 20, even though he continued to tell villagers after that time that he would not permit the project over their objections," he added.

"After that, the villagers requested that *OrBorTor* President Prayad clear up the issue. So on ations for the *OrBorTor*.

December 22, K. Prayad went to the village, where he admitted that he had given permission for the project in July - and then covered up the fact," he said.

"K. Prayad told the villagers, 'If you don't accept the project, then I don't accept it either', when in fact he had already signed off on it, giving Naracha the right to build it," he added.

However, K. Prayad told the Gazette that he had accepted the petition from the Baan Yamee villagers, saying he would consider it and try to organize another meeting between the villagers, Naracha and the OrBorTor.

He admitted that he had signed off on the project during a high-level provincial meeting chaired by the Governor of Phang Nga in July. All the other members of the meeting had already agreed to the project and signed the document, which needed only his signature for final approval when placed before him. He denied, however, that he had ever hid this fact from the villagers.

"It was a matter of public record, I am surprised they never knew about it," he said, insisting that the project's environmental impact and the villagers rights were always important consider-



akhon Sri Thammarat police are on the hunt for a gang of assassins who shot dead three men and left a fourth seriously injured in an ambush on Christmas Eve, as the victims were returning from a cockfight in Chang Kwang Minor District. The attack left the victims' car riddled with more than 50 bullet holes.

Killed were Daecho Khunsri, 41; Suchet Rakthim, 36; and Chakhirah Khaokham, 35. The injured man, Sutthichai Eotphijit, 33, was reported as being in a serious condition as of press time.

The following day, Pol Maj Gen Sudjai Yannarat, Commander of Nakhon Sri Thammarat Provincial Police, said that he believed the intended target was Suchet.

Suchet, who had a history of clashes, recently fled to his home in Surat Thani's Wiang Sa District to hide out with a well-known gambler and local leader in Nakhon Sri Thammarat, Gen Sudiai added.

Lt Col Somchok Jantamanee, Deputy Superintendent of the Chang Klang Police, said eyewitnesses reported that the attack happened very quickly and could remember only that the vehicle used in the attack was a metallic-colored pick-up truck with at least four gunmen in the back. After the attack, the truck turned round and headed back in the direction of Chang Klang, they told police.

The assassins had a small arsenal at their disposal to carry out the attack.

"The guns used in the attack included an M-16 assault rifle, a shotgun, a 9 mm and an 11 mm. There were at least 50 bullet holes in the victims' car. The vehicle was left riddled with bullets, which we collected as evi-

dence. We are particularly interested in the bullets from the M-16, as we want to find out if they were fired from the same weapon that was used to shoot Suchet a few months ago," Col Somchok said.

A source in the police investigation department said that Suchet was usually very mindful of security, always carrying a 9mm pistol. At the time of the attack, however, Suchet was speaking on his mobile phone and was unable to draw his weapon in time to return fire.

There were many possible motives for the killing, including business disputes over second-hand car businesses and auto service stations. The victim was also involved in an ongoing dispute with the wife of a Surat Thani politician, the source added.

Despite this latest massacre, disputes among influential people in Nakhon Sri Thammarat have decreased considerably,

said Gen Sudjai.

Violence related to disputes in other areas spreading into Nakhon Sri Thammarat could harm the province's image, he added.

Bus burglars busted: Four staff members on a Bangkok-Surat Thani tourist bus were arrested on December 27 for stealing passengers' valuables.

The bus ran a service aimed mainly at backpackers traveling between Bangkok and the islands of Koh Samui and Koh Phangan. The four suspects allegedly waited until passengers fell asleep before rummaging for valuebles.

Pol Col Wiraphan Thanjai, Superintendent of Region 5 Tourist Police, said the four were bus drivers and attendants working for Phukij International Co.

Norwegian bar owner shot dead

round 2 am December 14, Norwegian John Terry Peterson, 34, was shot dead outside his bar, the Opal Lounge, opposite Chaweng Boxing stadium on Soi Reggae, a popular nightlife

Eyewitnesses told police that Peterson and his friend Lars Jokim, 35, from Sweden, were seen arguing with a young Thai man. When they began to walk away from the dispute, the Thai man produced a gun, ran after them and opened fire before escaping with an accomplice on a motorbike.

Peterson was shot in the head and died soon afterward. Jokim was shot in the chest, but survived and was taken to the local hospital for emergency treatment.

After hearing testimony from several witnesses, including Peterson's girlfriend and business partner, Dorkged Meesungnern, 28, Pol Lt Col Boonma Geawlaiyat, Investigating Inspector at Koh Samui District Police Station, and a team of officers went to the house of Piyapong Mookrasda, 26, a waiter living in Bophut District.

Piyapong escaped through a window, but police arrested him later the same morning. He was found in possession of an unlicensed .32 pistol, the same caliber as the one used in the murder, loaded with three bullets.

He was taken to Koh Samui District Police Station, where he confessed to being involved in the shooting, but claimed that his friend, who had escaped, shot the




The head of the Thai Hotels Association on Samui, Ruengnam Jaikwang, recently said that it was time for Samui to opt for "quality over quantity" and called for faster solutions to the island's shortfalls. "It is now essential that the authorities catch up with the private sector in terms of development," he said. "The days of the relaxed, old 'This is Thailand' attitude are gone."

Initial signs suggest that, for this year at least, the island will continue to boom. An increase in visitors from other Asian countries has so far compensated for fewer European visitors, while new high-end hotels, such as the lavish Four Seasons resort due to open in February and the Conrad resort to be built on the island's south coast, are expected to affirm Samui's place on the international holiday map.

Legal Execution: The disturbingly-named Thai Legal Execution Department has opened a branch office on Koh Samui to assist with corporate legal disputes and business re-organization procedures.

Waragorn Rattanarak, the Chief of the Tambon Koh Samui Municipality welcomed the news and said he hoped it would help the island's businesses deal with legal procedures more swiftly and efficiently.



Spa MAGIC By Janyaporn Morel S wasana Spa

Ithough it has been two years since the tsunami, I still have trouble finding the courage to step on the beach.

But I tell myself that having a sweet pampering at a beachfront spa is an interesting reward I shouldn't let pass by as the year comes to an end.

So I muster up the courage to visit Swasana, at the Impiana Phuket Cabana Resort & Spa at Patong Beach.

Paratree "Tree" Jeyjoo, Spa Manager at Swasana, which opened three months ago, hands me a refreshing roselle drink and a cold towel soaked with lavender scent. I sit and talk with her in the lobby, where I can smell peppermint and orange throughout the room.

K. Tree explains that *swa-sana* means "tranquil" in Malay. The hotel's parent company, Impiana Group, is a Malaysian company. There is another Swasana spa at the Impiana Hotel on Koh Samui.

K. Tree shows me around the spa, which is decorated with dark wood and glass windows and designed in contemporary Thai style. The spa has three treatment rooms and two Thai massage rooms with a total of four beds and a foot massage room with two seats.

There is a private single suite with a Jacuzzi, floral bath and steam room; a double suite

for couples, with the same facilities as the single suite but with two beds; and a one-bed single room without facilities which connects to the foot massage room.

"We have eight therapists, but only seven are on duty each day, and our receptionist can administer treatments when we are at full capacity. All our spa products, which are very high quality, are from the Lemongrass House, which is easy for us to order from," K. Tree explains.

The spa menu lists Body Massages, Body Spa Treatments, Spa Facial Treatments and Spa Packages. The prices range from 690 baht for a 30-minute Hand Massage to 7,500 baht for The Royal Swasana package, all prices exclude a 10% service charge and 7% tax. Floral Bath, Jacuzzi and Herbal Steam treatment are optional.

I choose to have a sauna with the spa signature program "Swasana Massage", which uses

Swasana oil for the body massage. K. Tree says that the Swasana oil won the Spa Fair award last year in the "essential oil massage" category.

"We blend nine ingredients together. There are the scents of pomelo, jasmine, lotus, ylang ylang, sweet almond, sandalwood, Zingiber, jojoba and we use coconut oil as the base oil," says K. Tree. The oil gives a mixed, varied scent I haven't smelled before.

I am taken to the treatment room – the single suite – where there is a floral bath from where I can see the white sand and blue sea through the window. I am a little bit concerned that I can be seen by people outside but K. Tree says that with this window, people outside can't see me. Regardless, unfortunately I don't have time to enjoy the bath for long

The sauna room is now ready. K. Tree says that a herbal

sauna is very good for detoxing, and he suggests that I shower every five to 10 minutes in between sauna sessions, before having the massage.

I disrobe and shower in the sauna area, which is warmed to 40°C with vapors of lemongrass, galangal, ginger and cinnamon camphor filling the room. As I enter the sauna I have difficultly breathing, but soon I feel very relaxed. After the sauna I feel very fresh, and enjoy the hot tea that is ready for me.

Now I'm ready for the Swasana Massage, and so is Nipawan "Nit" Taengmee, my therapist, who is waiting for me. K. Nit starts by massaging my back, and then massages my shoulders and calves. She applies the Swasana oil while massaging and I feel all my worries drifting away.

It feels like there are 10 hands massaging my back and legs at the same time – lingering-

ly and continually. I ask K. Nit how she does it. She replies that Swasana Massage has been adapted from the Hawaiian Lomi Lomi technique, in which the masseur moves harmoniously with each massage step.

K. Nit then asks me to lay on my back, and she massages my legs, feet, stomach and body, and arms ending with my head and neck

After my treatment, I am served a hot balé fruit drink to help me relax that little bit more.

As I prepare to leave, I realize that I'm already thankful to K. Nit and the tranquil Swasana spa, which has managed to assuage somewhat my anxiety about being by the sea.

n a lazy evening in Phuket you might find concert violinist Aaron Meyers wandering the beach lost in some tune he has yet to write, or perhaps settled on the beach next to a drinks vendor. As the local man plays traditional Thai melodies and Western cover tunes on his guitar, Aaron is likely to be accompanying him on his violin.

No matter what he's doing or where he is, Aaron is likely forming a connection to someone through his music.

On one such evening late December, Aaron is preparing for his third concert at The Chedi, at Pansea Bay. The first tsunami charity concert was held just days after the 2004 tsunami, when Aaron and his wife, Renee, were already on their way from their home of Portland in the US to Thailand for a New Year's Eve concert in Chiang Mai.

They had planned to come to Phuket, but rethought their vacation plans after the tsunami ravaged Phuket's shore.

With encouragement from The Chedi, however, Aaron and Renee stuck with their plans and within days of arriving on Phuket, Aaron staged a concert to raise money for local villages. That evening they collected 400,000 baht, and immediately made plans

for another concert in December the same year, which raised 450,000 baht.

This year the concert raised another 400,000 baht and has become a tradition for Aaron, one he says he'll continue until he's no longer able. "In Thailand you have to move on, but people like to stop and remember and pay

their respects, and I think this is a way we can do it," Aaron said.

After returning to Portland in 2004 he gave interviews describing what it was like in Thailand after the tsunami. Aaron explained that he did these interviews to tell the truth about the extent of the damage in Phuket – to tell people that although some areas were hit hard Phuket was still safe to visit.

Perhaps it's inevitable that Aaron is a violinist. His father is a violin teacher. "My dad always taught at home, so kids were always coming to my home [to play violin]. I thought it was something every kid did," Aaron said. "I was immersed in it, surrounded by it."

But the spark that launched Aaron' career was a cake. When he was five years old, one of his father's students won a contest to perform with the Philadelphia Orchestra. Seeing the girl in front of the 110-piece orchestra impressed Aaron, but what really got him was the cake at the after party – it was huge and in the

shape of a violin.

Aaron told his dad that he wanted one too, so his dad instructed him on what he would have to do. "I was motivated, young and had a goal, and he fueled the fire," he recalled.

Aaron did get his cake – after he played with the Philadelphia Orchestra at age 11.

He admits that it was tough having his dad as his violin instructor, and there was a time during his college years when Aaron gave up playing. At the time he felt that he couldn't be involved in "serious matters" as a performer, but he gradually began playing again when he realized that he could make a difference as an entertainer.

"I'm able to be involved with other people and cultures through music. Everybody loves

music. We may not like the same kinds of music but we all like it in some way. To me, music is a universal language," Aaron said.

"Now I do something that I love, and I can be involved with things through music."

Perhaps the most notable performance Aaron has delivered was for the Dalai Lama when he visited Portland in 2001. Aaron was asked to write and perform a piece for him, and he vividly remembers the intensity as the Dalai Lama sat just 15 feet in front of him.

But Aaron's performance involves more than just playing the violin. He is fiercely passionate about creating and sharing his music, and he often plays with his eyes closed as the music carries him away.

"I don't think it matters what Aaron is playing, people just love to watch him play. It doesn't matter if it's classical or a Beatles' tune, or an original piece he wrote, people feel what he's projecting, which is love for the music and love for people,' Renee said.

She added that listeners also enjoy hearing the violin differently and not necessarily in a classical setting, as his band includes drums, guitar and piano, with the violin as the lead.

Part of this fusion can be attributed to Aaron's personal favorites. This self-professed Deadhead lists Brahms, Beethoven, Mozart and Jerry Garcia of the Grateful Dead as his favorite musicians. In a rare moment when Aaron isn't playing or composing, he likes to spend time lounging around their home catching up on emails or eating out in Portland.

world, and he and Renee say they are lucky to have extra resources to share and give something back. "If you give you shall receive," said Aaron.

"A lot of the things he does around home have to do with the children. Aaron's heart is with the children," Renee said. She added that there was one event he did that was tied to a school fundraiser, and after the event, 60 schoolchildren were so inspired by Aaron that they took up playing the violin.

Aaron had never played a concert in Southeast Asia before 2004, but since that first concert at The Chedi, he has gone on to play many concerts throughout the region, including one which created one of his favorite memories, performing with the Bangkok Symphony Orchestra.

When Aaron returns to play with the orchestra he hopes to bring in some traditional Thai musicians for a collaboration and fusion between Thai music and his own music.

"Maybe I can even write something specific – a new composition. I love combining the local music with what I do, it's a joint cross-cultural collaboration,' Aaron said.

He added that they hope to eventually record him playing with the orchestra and sell the album, with part of the profits going to the Bangkok Symphony Orchestra.





Speak softly, and carve a big stick

friend of mine, Detlef Loemker, makes sticks. A regular visitor to Phuket, Detlef, formerly the general manager of numerous Hyatt hotels and resorts around the world, makes the most expensive sticks in the world, or at least the most expensive ones I have ever seen.

But to clarify, I shouldn't say he actually makes the sticks; rather, he shapes them from the wood of olive trees hundreds of years old.

It's a hobby of his. When on holiday, he shapes a piece of olive wood to more closely resemble an animal that he had recognized when the wood was still on the tree. The trees are long dead, killed by deep frosts, but the wood deep inside is preserved.

But not all of the trees have usable timber. In fact, Detlef says, about 70% of them are useless.



Working with Rolf von Beuren of Lotus Arts de Vivre, Detlef carves and polishes a piece and then enhances it with silver and precious stones to form a cobra, dragon or whatever Detlef imagines. The first 30 pieces of his olive wood collection, which took a year to produce, are being completed at a workshop in Bangkok.

"The essence of olive wood in itself is linked very closely with the history of mankind, right into the present," Detlef explains.

"Olive wood is mentioned prominently in all three holy books of the major religions. During the Roman Empire olive branches were used as a peace symbol and they were presented as the tro-

phy in the first Olympics in Greece

"In addition, the consumption of olive oil as a health tonic is well documented. The longevity of the Mediterranean people is often linked to the use of olive oil in their daily diet.

"The health benefits of olive oil were such that Cleopatra is reported to having taken baths in it to provide the glow in her skin that made her beauty legendary," he says.

However, carving adds a

different dimension to use of the olive tree, and requires experience and skill.

As the collection catalog says, the fact that olive wood is classified as hardwood means it is not easy to work with. One has to spot the aesthetic structural design offered by nature before being able to carve and transform it into a piece of art.

The wood is then painstakingly hand-polished to reveal its beautiful dark inner rings. Such dramatic effect of the dark inner rings can be found only in olive wood that has stopped growing due to extreme cold-weather periods. Hence, selecting a branch to transform is a challenge in itself

The culmination of this process is a set of interesting pieces, even for a person of dubious artistic taste such as myself.

Among people who appreciate fine art, including well-known collectors in Europe, Detlef's works are apparently worth paying for.

"The trend is toward topquality refined and sensual lingerie and away from bland items that are not sexy or tacky items that belong more in a cabaret show," says Paul.



Flexing your mussels

ewcomers to Thailand might be surprised at how easy it is to find something to eat; there are so many restaurants and food stalls that it is possible to sate your hunger at any time, day or night.

The night markets and food stalls scattered about the island are especially popular for people on a budget looking for a quick, savory meal.

One such venue that provides a variety of tasty Thai dishes is Tek Kun, on Thepkrasattri Rd just a few hundred meters north of the Wor Kor Intersection

The *hoi tord*, or fried mussels, is the most popular item on the menu.

It is made by dipping green mussels in flour and egg, frying them on a flat pan, then serving them with bean sprouts and chili sauce.

It is very similar to the Phuket dish with mussels and taro

known as *ow tow*, which is also popular at Tek Kun.

Stall owner Thaparat "Rat" Ongpruksa and her husband K. Boonma learned their recipe for ow tow from K. Boonma's father, Pae Thow, who has been cooking it at the fresh market behind Robinson department store in Phuket City for about 30 years. K. Boonma's sister also runs a stall at market fairs.

Aside from these two local dishes, Tek Kun has other interesting dishes on the menu such as *pad Thai goong sod* (Thai fried noodles with fresh shrimp), which is served with the bud of a banana flower, bean sprouts and Chinese chives, giving a tasty twist to the traditional fare.

The restaurant also offers popular dishes such as *rad na* (flat noodles with gravy and chopped vegetables), *pad si-iew* (fried noodles with soy sauce), fried rice and more.

All dishes sell for about 30 baht. The stall is open from 6 pm to midnight. For more information call K. Rat at Tel: 089-4746011.

According to Honda...



he Accord has been around since the late '80s and has evolved into an advanced machine with several innovative features. Imagine a car that can almost steer itself. Well, the latest Accord is on its way to bringing that fantasy closer to a reality with its unique lane-keeping assist system (LKAS).

LKAS maintains the position of the car in lane by providing steering torque when necessary, significantly reducing driver fatigue and helping to prevent accidents.

In addition, an adaptive cruise control measures the distance to the vehicle in front and regulates the car's speed accord-

Want more? How about a clever high-tech MP3 audio system that adjusts the volume depending on the vehicle's speed?

There are three engine options available worldwide: a 2.2liter diesel, and 2.4- or 2.0-liter gasoline models. The diesel motor features common-rail technology, while the gas model incor-

porates variable-valve geometry, a concept that Honda applies to most of its cars.

The upmarket gasoline engine delivers a healthy 190bhp (140kW), while the diesel produces a leisurely 140bhp; torque from the latter though is a hefty 340Nm at the low engine speed of just 2,000rpm. The 2-liter variable-valve motor delivers around 150bhp, with peak torque of 190Nm, and it is this model that is likely to be popular in rural Thailand.

A six-speed gearbox is now

available across the range, while all models - sedan or wagon feature advanced drive-by-wire throttle technology.

Although there are subtle differences to the various Accord models, the body shape essentially remains the same. There is a new-look front bumper and a revised grille, while Honda also claims new windshield wipers which, it says, "increase glassclearing efficiency while reducing drag and wind noise".

Other "improvements" are a revised rear bumper, new rear lamps and a so-called new side sill trim, whatever that is. Despite all these cosmetic alterations, at heart it is still an Accord.

To be fair, the interior has received significant attention. The steering wheel rim is thicker, providing what Honda calls a "chunkier feel" and the gear shift lever is now easier to maneuver with a "gun-grip" handle.

The wagon also now has a remote tailgate power switch, an item sorely missing on the previous model. Other changes include a three-dial information panel in

front of the driver instead of variously located instruments. Back to basics, it seems. The instruments are finished in red, blue and white, which seems a little strange as Honda's corporate colors are just red on white.

Honda is still independent and likely to remain so. The company is profitable; it has successful operations in the US, the UK and in its native Japan; and this year it achieved its first Grand Prix victory in 40 years when British driver Jenson Button won the Hungarian race in August. Next year Honda is aiming for the world title with Button.

Its cars may be verging on boring to look at but they are ultra-reliable and tend to hold their value. Whether you buy an Accord or the lesser Civic, reviewed this time last year by the Gazette, you are buying into something worthwhile.

Before any readers send me an email complaining that the Accord pictured is not available in Thailand, it should be noted that Honda builds three Accords worldwide: one for Japan, one for Europe and yet another for the US. All differ in detail, but they are all still Honda Accords.





or three decades Robert Hughes was the art critic for Time magazine, writing with a firm personal voice that avoided both airy-fairy pseudo-poetry and the abstruse theorizing of the mullahs of modernism.

He also found the time to write nine books, including: The Fatal Shore, the definitive history of colonial Australia; Barcelona, a homage to his favorite city; and The Culture of Complaint, a scathing screed against the flaccid values of contemporary America.

Things I Didn't Know: A Memoir (Alfred A. Knopf, New York, 2006, 395pp) is his memoir of growing up Catholic in Sydney in the straight-laced '50s, fleeing to swinging London and serving his apprenticeship to art in Italy and Spain.

The list of his injuries fill a long and painful paragraph: multiple broken bones in his right leg and right arm, four broken ribs, and shattered collarbone and sternum. I don't think in all of the world's literature there is a more vivid description of the hallucinogenic horror of a monster auto crash.

Trapped in the wreck for hours, Hughes might have begun to pray, except for his fierce repudiation of his childhood Catholic faith.



'This filled me with abhorrence, a hatred of non-being. Not fear, exactly: more like a passionate revolt. In that moment I realized that there is nothing other than life itself, obstinately asserting itself against emptiness and nullity. Life was so powerful, so demanding, and in my concussion and delirium, even as my systems were shutting down, I wanted it so much."

During his long painful recovery, he resolved to write about this life.

So he returns to an account of his "At one point I saw Death," he Catholic childhood in Sydney, his family



war hero. Hughes provides a stirring account of his father's adventures as a World War I ace but many of the mundane details of his own suburban childhood are, frankly, boring.

But the narrative flickers back to life with his savage account of his Jesuit boarding school days. "Our religious education was, let us say, aggressive. Bellicose, in fact," he writes. After an indifferent academic career, Hughes stumbles into journalism and art criticism.

Five years after flailing about on the outskirts of Australia's art scene – full of wild eccentrics about whom he writes vividly - Hughes finally makes his escape in 1964 to swinging London. He is swiftly disappointed.

'I hardly met a single person in the 'underground' context who didn't, no matter how sexually available or amusing, turn out in the end to be ignorant and rather a bore," he writes.

"The depths of tedium that can be plumbed by sitting around half stoned, listening to people chatter moonily about reuniting humankind and erasing its aggressive instincts through Love and Dope, are scarcely imaginable to those who have not suffered them."

His new English wife turns into a drug-addled groupie and he flees to Tuscany. Here, exploring the world of Italian religious art, he has a series of epiphanies that bring tears to his eyes.

"It wasn't a question of confusing art with religion, or trying to make a religion out of art. As some people are tone-deaf, I was religion-deaf...But I was beginning, at last, to derive from art, from architecture, and even from the beauty of organized landscape, a sense of transcendence that organized religion had offered me but that I had never received."

The 1969 publication of the book Heaven and Hell in Western Art brings him to the attention of Time magazine and the memoir concludes with his flying off to New York.

Pier pressure

This week's Inside Story (pages 6 and 7) on the postponed construction of a pier and breakwater off Koh Yao Yai island in Phang Nga Bay captures nearly every aspect of the many environmental protection and human rights issues arising from the rapid development of the Andaman Coast region.

Most commendable is the strong determination of the villagers of Baan Yamee in protecting what remains of the region's most valuable asset – its rich natural heritage. They are in the frontline: isolated, yet unwilling to bow to pressure.

It is understandable that the headman of Village 3 did not want his name published. One need only look at the unsolved murder of Land Department officer Pongtorn Hiranyaburana in April, 2003 or the bombing of three homes in Chalong (see 'Chalong bomber still at large', news pages) to see how land ownership disputes are all-toooften settled here.

The developer, Naracha Co Ltd, conducted public hearings, but the residents of the village to be directly affected for some reason were not involved – and their objections either not heard or ignored.

The local office of the Marine Department approved the project, although a thorough Environment Impact Assessment was never submitted. Considering that much of Koh Yao Yai is national park land, one would think an approved EIA would be a critical factor in gaining permission – not an afterthought.

The fact that the island boasts so much national park land, with little private land available for development, makes the area highly attractive to the real estate industry. However, it has yet to be disclosed exactly what the project is being built to serve. Is one to believe that an 85-meter dock and a breakwater are being built solely to serve a 500-rai "holiday home" development? Time will tell.

The local Tambon Administration Organization President seems to have been pressured into signing his approval. Sitting in a meeting in front of the Phang Nga Governor and being asked to sign his approval, after being told that the heads of all the other relevant agencies had given theirs, is a predicament few elected officials would

Now that the Human Rights Commission is involved, with no less than Commissioner Vasant Panich leading the fight for the villagers, it seems he is willing to compromise on the matter.

So will the project move forward, as its developers claim? The decision now rests in Bangkok, where true power in such matters ultimately resides, to be made by those with little first-hand knowledge of the issues involved or understanding of the potential impact of their decision.



o solve the many problems arising from rapid development, first we must establish the actual number of people living and working in Phuket.

We have already talked with business owners, asking for their cooperation in providing us with comprehensive staff lists specifying how many of their staff are actually listed on Phuket house registrations forms.

Soon we will require all Thais who wish to move to Phuket and work here to have their names appear on a house registration form in the province before they can be allowed to work. We will also tackle this problem from the employer's side and not allow them to hire anyone who is not included on a Phuket house registration form.

Of course, some people may not know where to register their names as they do not have relatives in Phuket, but in cases like these we can make a separate house registration for them, even if they are staying in an apartment or condominium. The same will also apply to students from other provinces. We will not allow them to study in Phuket without registering with the province. In cases where people are living here [such as in unregistered dormitories], we will add their names to the central registry list of each district.

It won't be easy, but after we establish the actual resident population we will be able to refer back to this figure in budget requests to the government.


To get an idea of the disparity, consider vehicle registration. Transport office figures put the total number of registered motorbikes and cars at about 400,000 vehicles, but the population is just 290,000.

Therefore, we have to determine the real number of residents in Phuket as soon as possible so that we can get the mathematics

government's attention and be granted budgets for projects that are necessary to keep up with the actual rate of growth and development. Phuket Province remitted

about 850 million baht to the national coffers last year, so I don't think the government can reasonably expect such a large amount was generated by just 290,000 people.

To accomplish our goal, we will conduct an urgent "resident survey project". The Phuket Chief Administrative Officer (Palad) will lead the effort, which will include mobile units with computers and special software traveling around the island offering special services, such as registering for "smart cards".

At the same time, people from other provinces will be able to transfer their names to Phuket. The project is being drawn up right now and we have already discussed it with business owners, who have agreed to cooper-

In places such as China and Russia, citizens are required to notify the government if they move to another part of the country. We do not have laws forcing people to register in Thailand, but we will do our best to see that they do. We also have to keep human rights issues in mind as

Another related problem facing Phuket is the security of our residents. As we now have many people moving to live here

from other places, it is increasingly difficult for us to provide security for all local residents and tourists.

We have a rapidly-rising population, yet the number of police remains static. This is why we are experiencing an increase in criminal activity.

My predecessor, Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura, set up a project to check new arrivals at Tah Chat Chai Rd checkpoint. It is still underway, but we need to be more strict about this in the

As an island, we still have the issue of people who arrive by boat. We used to have about five offices where people arriving by boat could check in, but these have been replaced by a single "one stop service" center in Chalong.

We don't have enough officers in other parts of the island, such as Pa Khlok. This makes it difficult to keep track of who is arriving or departing by sea.

In the future, we might have Coast Guard vessels inspect boats at sea. It might be a nightmare to train the officers and get the necessary equipment, but if it is necessary we must consider doing it.

As an international tourist destination, visitors may ask us what security measures are in place to protect them during their stay here.

We now can tell them that after the tsunami we installed tsunami warning towers at 18 points around the island, with construction on another one still under-

A buoy with equipment that can directly detect tsunami waves has already been deployed and more are planned. This should give us better advance warning and more time to conduct an evacuation in the unlikely event that another tsunami hits our shoreline.

Of course we have to be vigilant to ensure that the system works properly at all times. We have already encountered one case of thieves stealing electric cable and other parts from the warning towers, rendering them inoperable.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a safe and happy new year.

Jaturong Keawkasi, an officer from the Phuket Provincial Land Transport Office, replies:

The reason there is no shuttle bus between Patong Beach and Karon is that the distance is very short – only about six kilometers – and it would be able to charge passengers only 10 baht each way.

If so, you will realize that putting your heart on the line takes an abnormally large amount of courage.


To lessen the pressure of attempting to fulfill all these ambitious resolutions at once, it would probably be wiser to make one good resolution and stick with that one for the year.

CROCODILE SNAPS BACK

ine months after fire gutted Crocodile Disco, the hotspot at the end of Soi Moulin Rouge has been resurrected as the new "Crocodile dclub". Nestled at the end of the busy soi, the club's green sign and overwhelming presence beckon revelers to the large dance floor and energetic atmosphere inside.

On a walk-through of the rebuilt venue, the most eye-catching and original design feature is the pair of balconies overlooking Soi Moulin Rouge, also known as Soi Katoey or Soi Crocodile. These offer a unique chance to watch the throngs of tourists, bar girls and elaborately-bedecked ladyboys on the street below.

Back inside, DJs Simon and Simon – one from England, the other from America – fill the latenight DJ shift with the quality and type of music found in Western clubs. When they are on the turntables you can expect good dance music from track to track. The dancers in the club were consulted for the music selections, ensuring that the DJs play music the girls want to dance to.





To that end, the club employs 20 dancers, and thanks to a collaboration with the new Erotica bar, trained dancers from Erotica will entertain customers nightly with special shows and choreographed performances. In

fact, Steve Jordan, one of the managers at Erotica, helped to design the rebuilt club.

Club Manager Robin Lee is no newcomer to Phuket's nightclub scene, having worked with Night Station and Rock World, Crocodile's former incarnation, as well as clubs in Singapore and Taiwan.

That experience allowed him, along with fellow manager Sean Healey and director Mats Wikstrom, to put all the pieces together for a high-quality venue despite the fast construction time.

"People like to watch other people," Mats explained, and that is why the upper level of the club has a clear view of the dance floor along with the view out to the soi.

The three men also made it clear that the new venture is neither a go-go bar, despite the elements of dancing, nor a discotheque, despite the large dance floor and shimmering lights. It is instead rightfully called a nightclub, with a bit of everything, including quiet areas to relax and have a conversation at less-than-shouting volume.

An honest review would point out both the pros and cons of the club, but with no cover charge – at least until the end of January, when the managers will re-evaluate whether or not to introduce a door charge – all beers at 100 baht and an "open until very late" policy, coupled with entertainment and good music, it's hard to fault the club.

Maybe the 200 baht gin and tonics are a bit pricey, but I'm not one to look a gift crocodile in the mouth.






OrBorJor reclaims Chalong Pier

CHALONG: The Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) resumed administration of Chalong Pier on December 1, ending six years of control by private companies. In their place, the *OrBorJor* hired Chokaree Tour Co Ltd to manage and improve the pier.

"The *OrBorJor* took back the pier because we want to make it a good image to present to people coming to Phuket. For six years the companies rented the pier, but they didn't develop it or take care of the equipment and the shuttle buses, and they didn't keep it clean," said *OrBorJor* Vice-President Suthin Uthaitamrong.

Chalong Petroleum Ltd Partnership, Kikon Marine co Ltd and Seaside Center Ltd Partnership previously operated the pier, but did not own the equipment used on the pier.

Lamphun Tangnoi, Manager of Chokaree Tour Co Ltd, said that the old system saw equipment being hired out and tourists transferred to the end of the pier by 9:30 am, but Chokaree's goal is to have everything transferred by 8:30 am. The company also plans to add two electric shuttle buses to the pier area.



Although the OrBorJor has taken back management of Chalong Pier, fees for services there, including parking, remain unchanged.

"I will also focus on the cleanliness of the pier. I venture to guarantee that you will never see more than 10 pieces of rubbish. I want it clean because I think of Chalong Pier as a window to Phuket that tourists see when they visit the island," K. Lamphun said.

K. Suthin explained that it will be more convenient for the

OrBorJor to administer the pier' operations because it will be able to directly oversee work done there.

"It's good that the *OrBorJor* is running the pier again because we can respond to problems faster. For example, if a section is broken, we can repair it, and if it is dirty, we can clean and clear it ourselves.

"We can also improve the landscaping, build convenience centers and increase security at the pier. We can do these all immediately, too, whereas before it was inconvenient and took much longer."

K. Lamphun estimated that the *OrBorJor* will generate 695,000 baht a month in income from the pier during the high season, 360,000 baht a month from May to September, and 530,000 baht a month from October to November.

Predicted costs for December are expected to be around 405,000 baht, he said, but with expenses for January reaching falling to about 295,000 baht.

Chalong Pier should be able to support more tourists than it currently does, K. Lamphun said.

However, he pointed out that parking and transfer problems limit the volume of traffic on the pier.

To help solve the problem, he said, new administrators will

"We can also improve the caping, build convenience ors and increase security at introduce a pontoon boat to replace the speedboats that currently transfer tourists.

"We have many plans for improving Chalong Pier, such as building a pavilion... and creating shade for tourists at the end of the pier waiting to be transferred," K. Lamphun said.

Service fees at the pier will remain unchanged: 10 baht per one-off transfer; 100 baht a boat for daily mooring; 20,000 baht a month for monthly mooring; 20 baht for car parking, or 40 baht for long-term parking.

K. Lamphun estimates that 600 vessels currently use the pier each day. Of those, 36% are small yachts, 30% are fishing boats, 16% are dive boats, 11% are large yachts, 6% are speed boats and 1% are travel motor ships


"We will not stop improving pier service here, at a profit if we can, at a loss if we must, but always with high-quality service so we can be the best local pier," he said.

ost financial advisers use insurance companies – in the plural. We are essentially brokers and we do not want, under any circumstances, to be tied to any particular financial institution. In turn, the offshore insurance companies do not want to employ a sales force except to market their products and services to independent financial advisers.

Any reputable adviser will always use several insurance companies, but normally will keep the number to a minimum. This keeps administration relatively simple but at the same time allows the insurance companies sufficient business to keep the situation viable.

Scottish Life International, part of the Royal London Group, is one alternative featured recently in this column.

This article, however, is about another major group with whom my company has daily dealings – Friends Provident International. It is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Friends Provident, which was founded in 1832.

The name "Friends" is derived from the Society of Friends, another name for the Quakers. Barclays Bank and Cadbury are other examples of Quaker businesses. For almost 170 years Friends Provident remained a mutual life assurance company owned by its policyholders.

Around 2000, they "demutualized" the company and listed the shares on the London Stock Exchange. Today, Friends Provident manages assets of around £50 billion (3.5 trillion baht).

The group also owns 50% of Foreign & Colonial along with asset manager Ivory & Sime and Luxembourg-based Lombard International Assurance SA.

Old Friends offer good assurance

Friends Provident is a member of the Financial Times Stock Exchange (FTSE or Footsie) 100 companies and also is ranked in the Fortune 500. Headquarters of Friends Provident International are located in the Isle of Man, with offices in Guernsey, Dubai and Hong Kong.

A little-known fact is that the parent group, Friends Provident, started an administration operation in India 10 years ago, but it is not a "call center". The staff in India has no dealings with either the public or even brokers (independent financial advisers). It functions as a true "back office". It has been so successful over the past decade that the Friends Provident Group has found it to be more efficient and to make fewer mistakes than their counterparts in the UK.

Normally, offshore assurance companies do not sell life assurance, but Friends Provident International bucks the trend. In reality, it is difficult to buy life assurance if you are an expat. Even for Friends Provident International it is a tiny part of its overall business.

You may well ask what business are the assurance companies in? The answer is asset management, but it is more complicated than that because the offshore assurance companies are really in the broadest aspects of asset management.

This leaves two questions: "What is offshore?" and "What are the broader aspects of asset management?" Offshore, in the case of assurance companies, means they are targeting the expat market by offering products that are highly tax efficient, flexible and personalized.

For example, Friends Provident has a product known as Reserve. It is available in two versions, collective investment and personalized. The former is designed to hold funds such as unit trusts, mutual funds, investment trusts and so on. In other words, registered collective investment schemes commonly known as "funds".

The personalized version can also hold individual shares quoted on any major stock exchange and bonds/gilts.

What Friends Provident International, and virtually every other offshore assurance company, is offering is often called a "wrapper". It allows investors access to almost every major investment group in the world at a huge discount.

If the investor wants to place funds with an investment

house that normally charges an upfront fee of, say, 5%, this is discounted by anything from 80% to 100%. Assurance companies themselves take no profit from this. They charge only a dealing fee on each purchase and sale.

I cannot think of an investment house that does not want to deal with assurance companies. In fact, investment houses have to satisfy the assurance companies that what they offer meets the standard of the assurer. The reason for this is simple – volume of business.

Just as manufacturers of many products fight for shelf space in the giant supermarkets and have to bow to the pressure on pricing, so it is in the assurance industry. Fund managers occasionally find that some of their funds are accepted and others denied. Property funds with high gearing are a good example.

Regardless of what investments the client selects, the assurance company conducts the purchase and registration of the investment. All assurers now offer daily updates on the values of all client portfolios as part of the service, regardless of the type of asset or currency.

Some assurers offer free beneficiary nomination forms. This removes the need and expense of a will for all assets held. In more complicated cases, they will often supply trust documentation free of charge or, in some cases, they will act as trustees for nominal amounts.

Assurers supply regular income streams if required. It is up to the client to state the amount and regularity of the payment: monthly, quarterly and so on.

They also offer free technical advice on potential tax or estate charges. They all have technical departments that are dedicated to this function.

Offshore assurers are all members of the Association of International Life Offices, which negotiates on an ongoing basis with many governments.

Friends Provident is also a leader in ethical investment, and manages money that complies with any major restriction on things such as tobacco, alcohol and firearms. They do not impose this on the general public, but will conduct it for charities and any religious body regardless of belief.

A profile could include funds for JP Morgan Chase & Co, Fidelity, HSBC, Allianz, Invesco, Investec, Merrill Lynch; everybody wants "shelf space". For many asset managers, assurers are their biggest clients.

Asset managers who do not deal directly with the public are more than pleased to accept business from assurance companies because it then becomes institutional business. As anti-money-laundering requirements are completed via the assurer, initially, investment houses are relieved of this burden.



hile some changes in the Phuket dive industry have been widely publicized, others have been transpiring qui-

Scuba Schools International (SSI) has been growing in membership numbers, as many former Professional Association of Diving Instructors (PADI) dive shops and instructors have been signing up to offer SSI certifications.

SSI is an internationally recognized dive agency that certifies divers from Open Water/Beginner level to Master. The switch has been brought on, in part, by a recent announcement that beginning in 2007 PADI will be increasing its fees for open water training materials

by 45%. The price hike has not been welcomed by dive centers and instructors. PADI is currently the dominant dive associa-

tion in Thailand, but on the gulf side SSI has been gaining in popularity, and more than 50% of dive centers are now offering SSI certification. Last month SSI certified more than 120 instructors in Thailand, including many in the Andaman region.

SSI Thailand General Manager Gary Hawkes explained, "SSI is the largest dive-schoolbased agency, as opposed to member-based. Instructors must be employed by a dive center, or report to the SSI headquarters."

Doing the scuba switch

There have been SSI headquarters on Koh Tao since 2002. "Regional management can make decisions based on local market trends, instead of making globalbased decisions. Instructors are affiliated with a dive center and freelancers must be affiliated with SSI headquarters.

"Our instructors prefer SSI's teaching philosophy because we try to create self-supporting divers who are aware of their own level of training and ability. We achieve this by teach-

> ing real-world skills that work under the worst possible conditions."

> SSI serves the local community, not just the dive centers. By buying materials

manufactured locally, the savings can be passed on to the customer. For example, since books used here are printed in Thailand, there is no freight cost, he added.

'Our prices on Thai and other foreign-language materials will be reduced by one third because they are made in Thailand." Also, certification cards are produced in Thailand and have just a 72-hour turnaround

SSI also supports Thai nationals to reach professional level

at its dive centers. When the dive center trains them for employment, the certification fees are waived and materials are provided for free.

Currently on Phuket two Thai nationals are certified SSI instructors, Dokmai "Born" Chada, working at Sea Bees Dive Center, and Gadegumpo "Patrick" Pecharatana, who works at Ocean Lovers Diving.

Gary and his team from SSI recently spent a few weeks conducting crossovers for dive operators on Koh Phi Phi Don. Now about 95% of the dive shops on Phi Phi are offering SSI certification.

SSI Instructor and Trainer Simon Speight explained, "We are dealer-based, and SSI Thailand offers the support and the follow up at a more personal level. Our materials, including books and DVDs, and certification costs, are priced to support the dealer and instructor, as well as giving the best value for our customers."

He added, "I am happy with the increasing interest in SSI as I believe we must be able to give customers a choice."

Gary said that at year's end SSI would have about 18% of the market share, and for 2007 he expects approximately 30%.


Currently in Phuket there are six affiliated centers, but in the next three months the number will increase to about 15. This will include long-time established dive shops, such as the Karon Beach branch of the Phuket Scuba Club and Sea Bees Div-

In Khao Lak there are currently three SSI dive centers, but the number is expected to double next year. SSI also has distribution points for materials at Seemann Enterprise in Chalong and All 4 Diving in Patong.

An SSI instructor crossover is relatively quick, as students are already qualified instructors and merely require an overview of the different standards and philosophy SSI has to offer.

Simon said, "Depending on the candidate's experience and what level we are crossing them over to, generally an open water instructor crossover only takes one or two days."

Tour de Thailand ends in Patong

PATONG: Eight cyclists arrived at Loma Park in Patong on the evening of December 28 after spending 26 days cycling the more than 2,500-kilometer from Chiang Mai in the fourth "Tour de Thailand 2006".

Fifty-two other cyclists, from the Phuket, Surat Thani and Tak Bicycle Clubs, who joined the tour on route, also crossed the line with the group from Chiang Mai

The youngest cyclist this year was Forbes Slater, 13, from the US. He was also the cyclist

who raised the most money for the charity event – 240,000 baht. The oldest biker was Dan Rhatigan, 67, also from the US.

The fourth Tour de Thailand 2006 was organized by the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) and Tour de Asia Bicycle Touring to support tourism in Thailand and to raise money to help the Foundation for the Blind in Thailand and the Max Foundation (TMF), which helps patients with blood-related cancers.


One million baht was raised for TMF and 250,000 baht for the Foundation for the Blind in Thailand.

he views from Villa Salika, overlooking Chalong Bay from its vantage point in Rawai, take in Phuket City in the distance; Nai Harn Beach and Laem Phromthep are a short drive away.

Furniture mega-store set to open opposite Big C

B Furniture House Co Ltd is building a new furniture mega-showroom on a plot of about 10 rai of land on the bypass road, opposite the Big C SuperCenter.

The showroom, set to open in June, will be SB's first outlet in Phuket and will be named "SB Design Square Phuket".

Terapol Temsuk, Executive Director of Thai Industrial & Engineering Services PLC (TIESCO), the main contractor for the project, told the *Gazette* that work on the project started in October last year and is expected to take about eight months to complete.

The project will comprise a two-story furniture showroom with a usable area of about 10,000 square meters. The building will also house a sales office and a design room, to be situated near

the intersection with Chao Fa West Rd, near a number of other furniture retailers.

"This showroom will be SB Furniture's first in Phuket. The property and furniture market has high potential in Phuket as there are many foreigners coming to live here and they like to design and decorate their houses in their free time. Therefore SB Company believe that now is a good time to enter the furniture market in Phuket," he said.

On the 10-rai plot, aside from the showroom, there will also be a staff dormitory and a 50-space parking lot. The buildings will be ringed with a sixmeter-wide road and there will be a fence around the outer perimeter of the project.


"The front of the showroom will be all glass. Inside there will be large open spaces on the two

floors to display the furniture," K. Terapol explained.

Gardening

his is Thailand. You've probably noticed that life here is pretty damn good overall. There can be one of several reasons you're reading this, come to think of it:

1) You live in Phuket; 2) You're on holiday in Phuket; 3) You've visited Phuket and rather like the place; or 4) You want to live in Phuket. Have I missed anyone out?

The point is that it's not a bad place to be. But there is a problem. Branston Pickle. You can't get it here, as far as I'm aware. Any non-Brits will have absolutely no idea what I'm talking about, but trust me when I say that this is the stuff that cheese was invented for. It's the food of the gods that makes a cheese and pickle sandwich a cheese and pickle sandwich.

I'm sure I'm not the only person on the island who hands a shopping list to anyone going back to the UK for a visit; Branston Pickle is always on it. As are several bags of Liquorice Allsorts and a couple of jars of pickled onions. Anyone visiting the other side of the Atlantic is given a request for Reese's Peanut Butter Cups. You just can't get any of those things here, which really is a bit of a problem.

The few less-mainstream Western consumer goods that you can buy over the counter here are ludicrously priced. Kettle chips at 50 baht a pack. They're good, but 50 baht? A few micrograms of imported cheese for several hundred baht? An Italian office chair I saw recently in Index for 40,000 baht? What are they on?



Pretty immigrants

At least I know that it's not the shop owners themselves who are lifting my leg – that's "ripping me off" for any confused Americans reading; I'll draw you a picture later. No, the fault lies solely and squarely in the hands of Thai Customs. Duty is whacked on at such a high rate that all imported stuff costs a fortune.

Have you tried to buy a jar of real English marmalade in Thailand? Or Vegemite (only Australians truly appreciate that bizarre stuff), or a decent bottle of wine? How about a Land Rover Discovery, or a La-Z-Boy

At least I know that it's not nop owners themselves who fiting my leg – that's "ripping off" for any confused Americading; I'll draw you a picarreading; I'll draw you a picarreading.

Monstrous duties on imported products certainly makes things fairly clear; when it comes to parting with your cash you're in little doubt about which products weren't made locally.

This country has done at least one sensible thing; they make their own version here. No confusion; it's simply a product originally from overseas that's now made in Thailand. And it's dirt cheap, as it should be.

Plants are no different in some ways; many of the plants here aren't native to Thailand. The clever thing is that it doesn't take international conglomerates consorting with diplomatic missions, or multi-million-dollar factories and government incentives to get them going. Once here, they just quietly get on with the business of growing, looking good and reproducing.

It would seem that it was the Europeans who started importing plants. The first international botanist, by all accounts, was a bloke called Christopher Columbus. The attempted avoidance of import duty is nothing new – that was the original reason he went off in search of plants to bring home, to try and lower the prices of existing imported spices from India.

What he first "discovered" were pineapples and chilies, neither of which were unknown to the locals of South and Central America, who already had been enjoying them for thousands of years. They were certainly new to Europe, whose later explorers introduced them to Southeast Asia soon afterwards, where they flourished for years to come.

The ti plant, or cordyline (maak phuu maak mia in Thai), with its green leaves, originally came from Polynesia, where the locals made skirts from the leaves. At some stage, somebody obviously thought it would be a good idea to start introducing the ti plant to other tropical parts of the world. Today, the original long green leaves have become a multitude of shapes and colors, to the extent that it's now barely recognizable as a single species.

In 1768, a French sailor called Admiral Louis de Bougain-ville began his long journey to the Pacific Ocean and discovered the vine that now bears his name – bougainvillea. Thais know it as *fueng faa*. He brought it home

and it quickly spread to just about every warm corner of the globe.

with Bloomin' Bert

Through the following years, this distinctive Brazilian beauty has assumed its place as one of the most popular tropical plants in the region. It's everywhere. Nobody seems to know how it spread so far so quickly, but it's not a bad looker, which is probably a big part of the reason.

The same mystery surrounds the king of the scented trees, the frangipani, or Plumeria (lanthom or leelawadee). Perhaps a Portuguese or Spanish ship brought over the first cutting from Central America, but over the centuries it has become a common sight in Buddhist and Hindu gardens and temples all over Asia. It was named after French botanist called Charles Plumier.

The two best-known members of the euphorbia family are immigrants to Thailand. The poinsettia, or *kissemass* in Thai, which we looked at recently, is originally from Mexico – even less of a reason for it ultimately to become the Christmas plant. Its far uglier cousin, the *euphorbia millii*, or crown of thorns plant, started out life in Madagascar. Same family, different homes.

Even the water lily didn't originate here. It was originally found in South America. Again, nobody knows how it made its way over here.

Gardens in Thailand really don't care where their inhabitants originally came from. We're just as likely to find heliconia from South America, plumbago from South Africa or peacock flowers from Madagascar as we are to find something that is native to this region, such as the ixora.

To be honest, nobody really cares. Does it really matter where a plant originated? We're probably best keeping fairly quiet about this. Who knows, if we ask too many questions, we are likely to find that we owe import duty on our gardens. Let's keep all this between you and me, shall we?
