Doubt lingers over the Legionnaire's 'outbreak' claims

PATONG: Reports in the Finnish press of Legionnaire's Disease being contracted by a group of tourists staying at a hotel in Patong have yet to be confirmed, as tests are still being conducted by the Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO), Ministry of Public Health and the World Health Organization.

As of press time, no proof of the bacteria *Legionella* has been found at the Phuket Grand Tropicana Hotel, where a group of Finish tourists stayed during a November holiday. In its most common form, the disease presents itself between two and 10 days after exposure.

However, it is still unknown if the tourists were staying at the hotel at the time of their exposure.

The *Gazette* has also been unable to confirm in how many patients *Legionella* has been isolated or who did the lab work.

Despite repeated inquiries, the management at the Phuket Grand Tropicana remained unavailable for comment. On condition of anonymity, however, a representative said, "It doesn't mean that we have the disease here, only that some guests [who contracted it] stayed here.

"It happened in November. Right now we still have guests as normal. An officer from the Health Department in Bangkok has already checked the problem here, so please contact them directly," the representative said.

wuthipong, Chief of the PPHO, told the *Gazette* that his agency reported the matter to the National Health Department (NHD), which sent officers to the site on January 12 to take air and water samples. The results have not yet been released, he added.

Pamuke Atchariyachai, Honorary Consul-General for Phuket by the Republic of Finland and Managing Director of the Kata Group of hotels and resorts, told the *Gazette* that he has not received any other reports of the disease in Phuket.

The Finnish Public Health institute reported January 9 that four tourists – two Swedish, one Finnish and one Norwegian – were hospitalized with pneumonia, a common presentation of the disease.

It also reported that Finn-

ish tour operator Aurinkomatkat has withdrawn all of its guests from the hotel. The Hong Kong government has also issued a travel advisory for Phuket.

K. Pamuke urges tourists and residents to remain calm. "For tourists, please understand that this disease is very rare," he said, adding that he hopes the Tourism Authority of Thailand moves swiftly in taking steps to set the record straight.

He added that he has heard no reports of tourists canceling vacations because of this scare.

Legionnaire's Disease is a water-borne bacteria spread primarily through air conditioning units, fountains or humidifiers. Once embedded in the fabric fibers of a building, complete disinfection is required for its eradication. The disease does not, **Continued on page 2**

Warning from tsunami buoy would be 'too late' – Smith

PHUKET: Because of its location, the lone tsunami direct detection buoy deployed last month in the middle of the Indian Ocean would offer little advance warning to Phuket in the event of a tsunami generated off the Indonesian Coast, Dr Smith Dharmasaroja, head of the National Disaster Warning Center (NDWC) in Nonthaburi, has confirmed to the *Gazette*.

Dr Smith said the location of the first buoy was chosen to provide equal benefit to all Indian Ocean Rim countries, not just Thailand

"I made the suggestion that we put the first buoy there so that we wouldn't appear selfish by putting our own data needs before those of other countries in the region," he said.

He added that the location of the first buoy, halfway between Thailand and Sri Lanka and about 1,000 kilometers from Phuket, would give little advance warning to Phuket in the event of a tsunami generated along the fault zone that runs along Indonesia's west coast.

The buoy is located about the same distance to the west of the fault line as Phuket is to its east. As a result, by the time a west-moving wave were detected by the buoy, its east traveling counterpart would already be inundating Thailand's Andaman Coast.

Dr Smith said the former government had approved a budget to buy more three more buoys to be deployed between the fault line and Thailand, but he doubts the interim government would move forward with the project as it has not supported the NDWC's work.

PHUKET: With 62 cases resulting in 204 arrests from December 1 to 30, gambling remains the top vice in crim statistics released by the Phuket Provincial Police. Illegal lottery ticket sales counted for 44 of the arrests.

Drug-related cases totaled 105 with 125 people arrested. Ya bah (methamphetamine) was involved in 35 cases, with 53 people arrested and 938.5 pills seized.

There were 33 people arrested for sniffing glue or paint thinners, 27 for possession of cannabis and two for possession for Ecstasy.

The number of cases involving krathom continues to rise, with nine people arrested for possession and 10,151 leaves seized.

Arrests for prostitution were also on the rise with 110 arrests, compared with 69 arrests in November.

Twelve people were arrested for possession of unlicensed firearms.

There were four attempted murders with three arrests made. No arrests were made in three rape cases reported on the island. Ten motorcycles were sto-

len with five arrests made. One car was stolen with police yet to apprehend the thief.

An engineering supervisor at the Grand Tropicana, who also spoke on condition that his name not be used because of the hotel's policy against speaking to the press, said that the air conditioners at the hotel are cleaned every month and have been cleaned as per schedule since the guests checked out.

About half of the rooms in the hotel use central air conditioning through a large unit, while the remainder have individual room units.

MAI KHAO: A former Sheriff in San Bernadino County, Califor-

nia, had valuables stolen from his luggage while it was on an Orient Thai Airlines One-Two-Go flight from Bangkok to Phuket January 10.

Californian Larry Morgan, who is in Thailand on a monthlong trip, said that he checked his bag in with One-Two-Go staff at Suvarnabhumi Airport about 7 pm on January 10. His flight, OG261, was due to depart at 8:15 pm, arriving in Phuket at 9:35 pm.

When he collected his bag in Phuket one of the zip tabs had been cut, leaving the zip free to be opened.

His video and digital cameras and mobile phone had been stolen, a loss of more than

crime to the Orient Thai Airlines office at Phuket International Airport (PIA) and later with the Tourist Police in Patong.

He was given a "Property Irregularity Report" by the airline, but told that Orient Thai Airlines is not liable for losses of electronic goods, among a list of many other valuable items.

The airline initially declined any form of compensation, as according to their conditions of travel, despite the fact that Mr Morgan had no other travel insurance.

Two other passengers on the flight also complained of having their baggage tampered with, said Mr Morgan.

However, Adun Rattanapalin, Orient Thai Airlines Phuket Airport Station Chief, said that those two complaints were about

damage to baggage, rather than theft.

K. Adun said that this was the first such case Orient Thai has had in Phuket. Orient Thai

is investigating the case and will send details to the airline's head office in Bangkok, he assured.

Although the airline does not usually compensate passengers for the loss of valuables in hold baggage, it might consider making an exception in this case, he said.

"We will have to inform our management board to consider [compensating Mr Morgan] as we are worried about damage to our good image," K. Adun said.

However, an angry Mr Morgan said, "I trusted that the airline employees would be honest and professional. I guess I was wrong.

"I couldn't believe that my personal belongings could be in jeopardy on a one-hour flight from Bangkok to Phuket.

"I now have to go up to Chiang Mai with only a disposable camera."

Karon desalination plant finally comes onstream

KARON: The reverse-osmosis (RO) desalination plant on the Karon coast began supplying water to Kata-Karon on a trial basis on December 29, Phuket Provincial Water Supply (PPWS) Manager Sayan Wareearoonroj has told the Gazette.

On January 12, the plant began pumping 4,000 cubic meters to Patong and 3,000m³ to Kata-Karon, also on a test basis, K. Sayan said.

"We expect it to be running at its full capacity of 12,000m³ a day by the end of this month," he added.

During the testing phase, the PPWS has been mixing the purer RO water with supplies from Bang Wad Reservoir in Kathu. Despite the increase in water quality, consumers receiving the RO water will continue to pay at the old rate for the foreseeable future. he said.

In Kata-Karon, reserves from the PPWS system will be used only in case of shortages, he said.

K. Sayan urged consumers to check their water pipes to ensure they can withstand the higher pressures that will be used with the new RO supply.

The RO water is potable, but people should ensure their storage tanks and plumbing are thoroughly clean if they plan to drink it, he added.

They should also wait until the PPWS has completely cleaned the municipal supply system by chlorination, he said.

There have been bureaucratic obstacles to the plant's operation because of the need to into the sea, but the plant should be granted full permission from the Ministry of Interior soon, he said.

The man responsible for building the RO plant, Jaturong Sa-duagkarn of REQ Co Ltd, told the Gazette that during testing the plant has taken in about 20,000m3 of seawater daily. About 7,500m³ of this is processed and the remainder drained back into the sea through a pipe that discharges about 800 meters off the coast at depth of about 16m.

Testing in the discharge area failed to find any difference in water quality there, he said.

Pamuke Achariyachai, Managing Director of the Kata Group of hotels and resorts, said the RO supply would come as a relief to long-suffering hotels in the area, which have for years been forced to buy supplies from water trucks.

K. Sayan said that areas relying on the main PPWS supply system needn't worry about shortages this dry season.

water to get through the dry season. We face the same problem every year, so we know how to plan for it," he said.

The PPWS now has an additional 2 million m³ in reserve water supplies from the Hitlor and Manik lagoons in Tambon Srisoonthorn, which are now connected to the PPWS system via a 17-kilometer pipeline completed last year.

The PPWS has also signed an agreement with REQ to buy additional water, if needed. REQ maintains two water supply sources in Kathu and one in Chalong. Together these can supply up to 4,800m³ a day to augment PPWS supplies, he said.

Phuket City has its own municipal water supply system, which uses Bang Wad Reservoir and tin mines as sources.

Janpen Kotchakarn, who heads the municipal water supply's production unit, said her office would continue to monitor and adjust pressure rates to minimize waste while ensuring there

Traffic jams mar one-way launch

PATONG: The January 15 launch of Patong's one-way traffic system passed without accident but was marred by early evening traffic jams along Thaweewong Rd.

"On the first day we had a few small problems with vehicles moving slowly due to drivers being unfamiliar with the system, but these are just teething problems and the one-way system will improve traffic problems in the long term," said Pol Col Teerapol Thipjaroen, Superintendent of Kathu District Police Station.

"In the evening from about 5 pm to 7 pm there were tailbacks on Thaweewong Rd – that is rush hour in Patong, when people finish work, tour buses take guests back to their hotels and tourists go out for dinner or to see a show. We will work on this problem," Col Teerapol assured.

"There were no serious accidents all day. There may have been a few instances of cars or bikes scraping each other, but nobody was injured," he said.

Col Teerapol admitted that the new system still lacks sufficient signs to direct traffic. "Be-

cause Patong Municipality has budget problems it may take a while until we have a full complement of signs in place," he said.

"Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd had no traffic jams; the only problem was on Thaweewong Rd. We experienced no problems with traffic driving on the right-hand side on [sois connecting Thaweewong Rd and Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd] such as Haad Patong, Sawatdirak, Bangla and Ruamjai.

'We designed the system this way because we didn't want cars to have to cross each other when turning onto and off Thaweewong and Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi roads, which could have caused accidents," he explained.

"Now we have to improve traffic-flow control in the evening and increase the number and clarity of direction signs," he added.

"All in all, the first day of the one-way system in Patong was a 90% success," Col Teerapol concluded.

Reactions to the change was mixed among Patong residents. Pairot Damrongratchasak, a travel agent on Thaweewong Rd for more than 10 years, said, "I think the one-way is an improvement. People can cross the road more safely now, as they don't have to look both ways.

"It should decrease traffic jams, though I did see problems in the evening when people were finishing work. I am confident in the system though and I didn't see any accidents [on the first day].'

However, Jaroen Trongjit, a motorbike taxi driver in Patong for more than 14 years, said, "The one-way system does not ease traffic jams on Phra Barami Rd.

"The one-way system will also mean I have to drive further and use more petrol. I prefer the old system", he complained.

Jungceylon borrows 2.6b baht for expansion

PATONG: Suchad Chiaranussati. President of Jungceylon's parent company Phuket Square Co Ltd, has signed a six-year loan with the Bank of Ayudhya and Kasikornbank to secure an additional 2.6 billion baht to "expand" the shopping complex.

The money will be spent on the plaza area, decorations, a road expansion and to finish construction of the on-site hotel.

K. Suchad said that since

opening on December 20, Jungcevlon has received positive feedback from tourists and residents.

They estimate about 10,000 people a day visit Jungceylon, and expect up to 50,000 a day after the grand opening in March.

Jungceylon is now 95% complete, and is expected to be fully operational by March.

Construction of the 400room, five-star Millennium Resort Phuket, however, is 30% completed and expected to be finished by the end of the year.

Hotel thieves nabbed at airport PATONG: A 20-year-old man 13,000-baht digital camera and

and a 14-year-old girl were arrested at Phuket International Airport January 10 while in possession of more than 250,000 baht worth of Swiss francs and a digital camera they had stolen from a Patong hotel safe.

Kathu Police Duty Inspector Pol Lt Col Pisit Chunpet said that the thieves, who he declined to name, were from Bangkok and arrived in Phuket January 7.

They checked into Patong Beach Bungalows, where Hanh Rudolf Burkhard, 58, and his wife were staying.

Mr Burkhard and his wife discovered their hotel room had been robbed after returning from dinner shortly after midnight January 10, Col Pisit said. A

the key to their safe in the hotel reception had been stolen.

The receptionist who allowed the thieves to open the safe said that he thought the couple were staying in the room since they had the key, Col Pisit said.

Police identified the thieves on the hotel's closed-circuit camera recordings, and discovered a photo of the man in a bag still bearing airport security stickers in the thieves' room

The suspects were arrested at the airport just after 9 pm January 10. They were taken to Kathu District Police Station and both were charged with theft.

Mr Burkhard's money and camera were returned to him the same day.

Property expo expected to set record

PHUKET CITY: The Property Investment Exhibition 2007 (PIE), the annual property show staged by the Phuket Provincial Land Office and Phuket Real Estate Club (PREC), is expected to set a record 500 million baht in sales and reservations, Thanet Traiwut, Managing Director of exhibition organizer Delice Thai, has told the Gazette.

Most of the properties sold or reserved were valued at five to 15 million baht each, he said, with reservations of more than 50 million baht made during the show

The expo, held at Central Festival Phuket from January 12 to 16, attracted some 50,000 visitors, he added.

However, he said that sales



of more than 500 million baht were expected within one month after the exhibition.

Last year, more than 300 million baht in property reservations were made as a result of the show.

PREC President Phumisak Hongyok, who is also Phuket's representative at the National

"This is evidence that the recent changes in government policy will have only short-term effect, but in the long term this policy will be transparent, just be patient," he said.







FAULTY TOWERS?

Frankie Neo, Director of Singapore-based Kemilinks International Pte Ltd, one of the companies that cooperated to design, build and install tsunami warning towers for Phuket at their own expense, claims, "The [initial three] Patong sirens are now not working in the manner they were donated for, and they have not undergone the routine remote testing.


"[Raynart] cannot integrate [its systems] with our technology and so will have to switch out all the parts, except for the tower structure and exposed horns... the beach siren is designed to incorporate many levels of amplification, self- and remote-test features, 10KHz live sound test, and so on," Mr Neo told the *Gazette*.

"All these advance elements and circuitries will not be retained and will have to be thrown away. They cannot control the system, because they have no previous experience in Inmarsat satellite technology on which it is based," he added.

"SiRcom GMBH, Kockum-Sonics, Kemilinks and TMS International (Thailand) collectively donated and installed the system to work as a state-of-the-art warning system, performing at the highest standard.

"The Patong system was well-planned, designed, manufactured and installed to the satisfaction of Patong Municipality. They served wonderfully in various drills and activations, featuring widely in many media articles. So the public may still believe that the system will work like before," Mr Neo said.

The TMS consortium was one of three qualified bidders when the Thai government in August 2005 accepted online bids for the installation of 62 more warning towers, but the winning bid came from Bangkok-based

Raynart and its partner ASC.

To integrate the three Patong towers into the new system, Raynart personnel modified the Patong system so that it would be compatible with Raynart's satellite-relay equipment linking it to the National Disaster Warning Center (NDWC) in Nonthaburi province, near Bangkok.

But Mr Neo is concerned that the Patong system has been compromised as a result of its integration to the Raynart system, which he claims is inferior.

"The donors never had any intention to allow its competitors or unauthorized persons to gain access to the equipment, to tamper with or copy its technology and put it out of its original action. The public deserves to be informed that the system was never re-tested after being tampered with," said Mr Neo.

"Since the Patong sirens will not work as they did after they were donated, we have requested that all donated equipment be returned so that our names will not be tarnished if the system fails to work properly..."

ACCUSATIONS

"The other donors had no official notification whatsoever from the authority [about modifications] and we have to conclude that such actions can only be to circumvent the e-auction Terms of Reference (TOR) and constitute an unfair and unjust favor to the supplier." said Mr Neo

In November 2005 he sent a seven-page letter to the Meteorological Department and Auditor General's Office on behalf of the consortium, charging numerous breaches of the TOR and requesting an investigation. Among the charges was the claim that ASC uses satellite communications technology to which Kemilinks had been granted exclusive rights.

Citing the Inmarsat satellite service provider's traffic logs and other sources, he says the system was never tested as required by delivery date specified in the the TOR.

"This affects many lives, so our consortium is requesting the authorities put the sirens back to work in their original manner, return all the donated equipment and protect the donors' intellectual property rights and reputations. We request for a thorough investigation and verification that the TOR and e-auction terms were fair, equal and justly applied to all bidders," he concluded.

However, Raynart General Manager Aurasa Paenghom said her company had studied the TOR carefully and had successfully installed 62 towers at a cost of just 61.4 million baht, which was initially budgeted at 138 million baht.

ASC, which owns the technology Raynart uses, has 25 years' experience in disaster warning systems, she added.

"Since we were awarded the contract, Mr Neo has claimed that our system will not work except by linking through their system, since he has exclusive rights to use D+ terminals manufactured by Satamatics," she explained.

To refute this claim, she provided the *Gazette* with a copy of letter signed by Satamatics Global Unlimited CEO Peter Chisholm stating that both ASC and Raynart are licensed to use the network.

K. Aurasa said Raynart installed the first 24 of its 62 towers early in 2006. On March 20 last year, nine new towers in Phuket were tested to the satisfaction of the NDWC committee, and news of the successful test was carried in the media, she said.

SILENT TESTS

K. Aurasa said the NDWC conducts "silent" tests of every site every two days. "The NDWC sends the signal via satellite and the towers respond by reporting the status of the equipment. If any of the equipment is not functioning properly, such as having an open door or low battery, this will be indicated by a red warning sign. The system has an advanced design so that we do not need to cause undue public panic by [audibly] testing it," she said.

Organizing audible testing and evacuation drills was the responsibility of the local Phuket Provincial Office of Disaster Prevention Mitigation (ODPM), she added.

Phuket ODPM Deputy Director Damri Sangsarp told the Gazette that Phuket now has 19 warning towers, all of which operate properly and are routinely tested by the NDWC.

K. Damri said there were plans to conduct an island-wide audible testing of the towers and evacuation drill, but that a date has yet to be set. There are no plans to conduct an unannounced emergency evacuation in the province, however. "We lack the public relations necessary for that," he said.

In the hot seat, Patong Deputy Mayor Chairat Sukkaban admitted that he doesn't know with certainty whether the three towers in Patong function properly.

"It is all controlled by the NDWC in Nonthaburi. They can check it on computer. I have asked them a few times and they tell me it works, but I can't really

know until they [audibly] test them," he said, adding that he intends to ask for the towers to be tested in March.

He confirmed that his staff had given Raynart's technicians access to the towers and the control room, in a room at Patong Fire Station. "Two or three months ago they [Raynart] came to change the program... They said they wanted to change some electronic parts. After that I asked them if everything was okay and they said it was. Then they went back to Bangkok.

"They didn't test it audibly, but I think they can tell if it works from the control room in Bangkok," he said.

However, Dr Smith Thammasaroj, head of the NDWC, told the Gazette, "We cannot test the sound because the local authorities... don't want to disturb the tourists during the high season.

"We would like to test them [audibly] every four to six months, but we can check them [silently] from Bangkok. The system will report back and report any malfunctions to the center in Bangkok. Fortunately, we haven't had any reports of malfunctions from the towers yet. I think it is working okay, but I will double-check it," he said.

He added that the TMS consortium had long been critical of the NDWC system. However, he suggested that the TMS consortium direct any complaints to the Meteorological Department, which owns the equipment.

His comments came as no

surprise. Dr Smith has openly criticized the Chulanont government for derailing a plan to make the NDWC an independent body with its own budget. Instead, the NDWC has been placed under the Meteorological Department and its former mandate to install disaster warning towers throughout the country put on hold.

When told that the equipment donors had already written a letter to the Meteorological Department requesting the equipment be returned, he said, "They can take it away if they want to. That's okay, but they have to contact the Meteorological Department.

BUDGET

"We do not own the equipment yet, because the NDWC is not legally set up by the government yet. We cannot buy anything. Why don't they contact the Meteorological Department if it doesn't work? They could get a budget to fix it," Dr Smith said.

"If all the equipment belonged to the NDWC we would have a budget to fix it. But not now. I have a problem with this government... They do not appreciate NDWC work, so I cannot do anything now.

"Tell them [the TMS consortium] that if they want to take it back then that's okay, I don't mind... If they take it back we will have to buy another one to replace it, but I don't think it would be very nice of them to take it back," he said.

Brown nectar of the gods

PHRAE: Scores of villagers in throughout the district and into Phrae were given a gut-wrenching shock when a "holy" spring they had prayed to and drunk from turned out to be the result of faulty plumbing rather than a gift from the gods.

The font was discovered on January 4 by Anong Kwanphetch, 52, in the middle of her lawn in Tambon Mae Jua, Denchai District. Noticing something unusual, she went to investigate and discovered water bubbling up from the ground. When she poked around to try and find the source of the water, it began to flow out even stronger than before. Amazed, she rushed to tell the neighbors about her discovery.

K. Anong thought the spring might somehow be connected to a vision she had the night before. Her late maternal grandmother had appeared to her in her sleep, saving she felt ill and needed paracetamol. When Anong returned from fetching the medicine, her grandmother had vanished.

Thinking that perhaps her grandmother's apparition was a hint that water from the spring could be carrying magical powers, Anong brought out flowers, candles and joss sticks to worship the spring, asking it to provide water for her to keep as a cure-all potion.

News travels quickly in rural Thai villages, and before long word of the phenomenon had spread neighboring ones. One neighbor, 66year-old Thongin Konsin, said she had to wait in line for her chance to collect some of the miraculous elixir.

Like many others, she offered candles, incense, flowers and a 20baht note. She was convinced that holy water was bound to be a gift from on high sent to reward their merit making and heal the infirmities of poor villagers whose conditions had not been healed by the government's 30-baht health care scheme.

The crowds around the spring grew quickly as some 1,000 villagers rushed to collect bottles of the bubbling broth. When some villagers called for the spring to perform a miracle and send forth bubbles, it immediately responded and answered their pleas.

Word of the find soon spread to district authorities and before long Senior Administrative Officer Rasi Srithammarat and Suthat Samon of the Denchai Public Health Office came to investigate. Unable to stop the villagers from acting on their beliefs, they allowed them to continue collecting the water but implored them to boil it before drinking.

K. Rasi decided to wait until crowds thinned before digging to find the source of the water. If they dug while there were still many people wanting to collect the water and the water stopped flowing, he said, it could cause an even bigger problem.

The next group to arrive at the spring were Public Health Officers from Somdej Phrayupharach Hospital. When they tried to collect a sample of the water, the spring suddenly stopped and the ground became dry. Finally the officers had to beg a sample from one of the villagers. After about 20 minutes, the water began to flow again, leaving villagers suspicious that the officials' attempts to collect a sample had angered some deities.

Surin Niphayothin, Kamnan (tambon chief) of Mae Jua, finally got to the bottom of things. He and a group of villagers began digging for the source of the mysterious liquid and soon found a small, leaky PVC pipe. On further investigation, K. Surin found that the pipe led straight to the old toilet of a house no more than four meters away.


When villagers who had been drinking the "holy" water learned its true source, scores of them joined in a large mass vomiting session.

The owners of the pipe said they had been installing a new toilet and that the plumbing work must have caused the sewerage pipe to crack. They said they had no idea their old toilet could have been the source of the "holy" spring.

PM urges youth: 'Refrain from sex'

nterim Prime Minister Surayud Chulanont has urged Thai youths to refrain from having sex until they are of an "appropriate age" and to practice the principle of His Majesty the King's self-sufficiency philosophy in making career choices.

During a meeting with 750 outstanding youths from around the country, PM Surayud said Thai youths should make sure their lives were on the right track and choose things they like to do as careers, as that would bring more chances of success.

They should not follow the example of Western culture in all things, he said, especially sex.

Young people should listen to their parents and young men and women should not to indulge in sex, but wait until the "right" time.

Social values differed in different societies and Western culture did not greatly value the virtue of virginity, he said.

PM Surayud urged Thai boys to act like gentlemen and not take advantage of girls. He also advised youths to apply the King's self-sufficiency philosophy as a practical guide to living their lives, following the motto, "Have virtue in the heart, practice selfsufficiency economy, and avoid all vices."

Blasted revenue: Thailand's tourism revenue in the first quarter 2007 will be slashed by 8 billion baht as the number of foreign tourists is expected to drop by 600,000 due to the bomb blasts in Bangkok, according to Kasikornbank's Research Center.

It was originally expected that in 2007 Bangkok would welcome 15 million tourists, up 9% from last year. These tourists would spend 220 billion baht, according to projections.

However, the New Year's Eve bombings forced many countries to issue travel warnings. The higher number of patrolling police officers in the capital will also damage the overall environment.

"This should reduce the tourist arrivals by 600,000 in the first quarter, 17% down from the target," the center projected.

Booze battle, part two: Follow-

ing its failed bid to ban all alcohol advertising, the Public Health Ministry has decided to put graphic warning labels on all alcohol products similar to those already in use on tobacco products.

The committee tasked with controlling alcohol consumption is planning to include the step in its latest package of measures aimed at curbing liquor abuse, said Disease Control Department Deputy Director-General Dr Narong Sahamethaphat.

If endorsed by the Cabinet, warnings would be put on alcoholic beverages, including pictures showing the risks and harm associated with drinking alcohol, and strongly worded text.

Dr Narong, a member of the committee, said the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) would draft this part of the proposal.

A source from the FDA said such a new measure would face numerous bureaucratic obstacles, including a requirement to circulate a draft of the announcement to member countries of the World Trade Organization for comment.

"It's quite the wrong way to go," the source said. "Drinkers tend not to pay attention to warning labels before buying or drinking."

Payback: The Student Loan Fund (SLF) plans to sue about 60,000 graduates for failing to repay loans that funded their studies.

Fund manager Prempracha Supasamout said that defaulters rarely even replied to repayment notices warning of possible legal action.

"We need to file the lawsuits by July 4 or else the statute of limitations for these cases will pass," he said.

The cases involved about 6 billion baht in principal, interest and fines, he said.

Amazing: The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) will drop its recently launched "Thailand Unforgettable" publicity campaign and resume the previous "Amazing Thailand" campaign, new TAT Governor Pornsiri Manoharn has announced.

The new campaign, initially intended to run for at least three years, was being withdrawn because it had received too poor a reception from the private sector. The decision is also in line with the sufficiency-economy philosophy of the government to save funds, she added.

K. Pornsiri said that the TAT would relaunch the "Amazing Thailand" campaign at the annual Asia Travel Forum in Singapore at the end of January.

High-season brings chaos to Samui streets

marked increase in traffic on Koh Samui is creating daily gridlock in the island's most popular areas and making the roads almost un-crossable for pedestrians, many of whom are visiting tourists.

Exacerbating the problem, traffic lights recently installed at major junctions were switched off by the Highway Department because of technical problems that they claimed could have led to serious accidents.

According to Baramee Patanasiri, Director of the Surat Thani Highway Department, Koh Samui Municipality installed the traffic lights to improve safety, but failed to use technical experts, which meant regular malfunctions.

The department chief also warned that Koh Samui's dilapidated road system is falling apart under the strain of the 22,000 cars that drive around the island every day.

The main ring road has been under serious stress for more than

a complete overhaul as several major sections have crumbled with heavy rains causing gullies and cracks to appear.

"When we repair one part of the main road, another part collapses," he explained. "It's time for Samui to demand a budget

large enough to rebuild the road system on this island."

Fast-paced development has led to widespread construction on Samui and the roads were not originally built for the kind of heavy vehicles now using them.

If a major reconstruction project is not initiated soon to replace damaged stretches of road, transport officials say Koh Samui may face a crisis that could seriously damage the island's reputation and also the local economy.

Full shoot-out after Full Moon: On January 3, Pol Capt Thirapon Gunha of the Koh Pha Ngan police was called to the scene of a shooting, which took place in the island's main town of Thong Sala.

When he and his team arrived they discovered the body of Channi Thongmak, 47, who had been shot several times.

Channi was the owner of a local transport service that takes tourists from the pier at Thong Sala to the famous Full Moon Party on Haad Rin.

Just a few meters away lay the body of a second man, identi-

fied only as Sawang, who had also been shot dead.

According to witnesses, Channi was waiting in a queue with other drivers to pick up passengers from the pier. They told police that Sawang simply walked up to him and started shooting.

People standing close by panicked and ran. During the chaos that followed, another man appeared and shot Sawang before disappearing into the fleeing crowd.

Police believe Sawang was a hired gunman, who was shot to protect the identity of the person who hired him. They also believe the shooting was linked to a dispute over transport franchises on Koh Pha Ngan. Channi's brother was shot and killed in a similar incident last year.

Samui's new seasons: The Four Seasons Hotel is set to open on Samui in February, adding the location to the chain's luxury portfolio, which is already a considered one of the industry's best.


pies the spectacular Laem Yai peninsula. The 60 luxury villas offer one to four bedrooms and average prices will be between US\$450 and \$650 per night.

73 teachers murdered since 2004

female teacher who was the niece of exiled Muslim leader Wan Kadir Che Man was killed January 9 when suspected militants attacked a pickup carrying her and a group of colleagues plus a doctor.

Saimah Mayamae, an elementary teacher at the Toh Bala School in Pattani's Sai Buri District, died at the scene after being hit by two bullets fired at close range by a gunman riding pillion on a motorbike that pulled alongside the moving truck.

Police said the gunman targeted Dr Dohmae Pengla, a rural doctor attached to Sai Buri's Public Health clinic, who was driving three female teachers to their school.

Dohmae ducked for cover after the first shot nicked his neck. The gunman then fired two more shots, killing Saimah.

Born in Sai Buri, Wan Kadir has been living in exile for nearly two decades working as an academic.

Two years ago, Wan Kadir retired as the head of Bersatu, a longstanding separatist movement, and expressed his desire to return to Thailand to work toward reconciliation between ethnic Malays in the South and the Thai government.

His request was turned down by the Thaksin administration but Thai sources said senior Thai officials held a secret meeting with him to discuss various issues pertaining to violence in the Deep South.

Wan Kadir's niece Saimah became the 73rd teacher or education worker to have been killed since January 2004 when violence began escalating in Thailand's three southernmost provinces. More than 1,900 people, mostly local Muslims, have been killed.

The latest attack came

amid a week of tension between police and villagers in nearby Kapoh District, who have been demanding the release of a suspected militant.

Secretary-General of the Internal Security Operation Command Region Four, Maj-General Chamlong Khunsong, vowed not to give in to villagers staging daily protests to demand the release of Sama-ae Jeha.

Chamlong accused the protest organizers of carrying out a number of attacks, including the shooting in Pattani, M79 grenade attacks on the Kapoh District Office and an attack on an army outpost in Tambon Pong Hoi.

Aged assassinated. A former *kamnan* (tambon chief) of Haad Phan Krai, Chumpon, was shot dead as he was returning to his farm after morning coffee with friends January 12.

The victim, Sophon Janpranot, 62, had previously been named "Kamnan of the Year" and was the owner of a cattle farm. He was shot three times in the abdomen with a sawed-off shotgun.

Police collected three spent cartridges from the scene and found the gun thought to have been used in the attack about 100 meters from K. Sophon's body.

Police believe that the motive for the crime is likely to be connected to a land dispute or to women.

Boy gunned down. A 15-yearold-boy was shot dead and two more teenagers injured by a gunman apparently enraged by the boys driving around and setting off cherry bombs in Cha-uat District, Nakhon Sri Thammarat.

When police from Cha-uat District Police Station led by Pol Cap Chakkrit Kongreuang arrived at the scene about 12:30 am, January 10, they found Surachet Khongrot, 15, and Chairat Thongchu writhing in a pool of blood alongside the body of Phrainarong Jewsook, 15.

Surachet, who was shot in the hip and kneecap, and Chairat, who was shot in the chest, were rushed to Cha-uat Hospital and later both pronounced in "safe" in condition.

The boys said that they had been riding a motorcycle, setting off cherry bombs along the way.

They heard six gunshots in quick succession and then Phrainarong, who was sitting on the back, fell off the bike. Surachet, the driver, then lost control of the bike and he and Chairat fell to the ground.

Neither of the boys could say from which direction the shots came.

Cap Chakkrit said that he could not yet be sure as to the motive for the attack but added that the gunman may have been someone annoyed by the boys letting off cherry bombs.

Cropped short. Border Patrol Police based in Nakhon Sri Thammarat seized a more than 400 kilograms of *krathom* (an indigenous plant that acts as a

mild stimulant) in two raids January 11.

The first haul was made at Baan Khok Khram Railway Station in Ron Phibun District, where, following a tip off, Border Patrol Police seized 200kg of *krathom* leaves packed into cardboard boxes.

Police then seized more than 200kg of *krathom* at a house in Nong La Ohn village in neighboring Chalerm Phrakiat District, where Nuphan Kaownuan, 52, was found packing *krathom* into plastic bags.

Nuphan told police that she was preparing the *krathom* in her house to be sold to tea shops in Nakhon Sri Thammarat for three to five baht a bundle.

She had collected the leaves from a nearby wild field, she said.

Nuphan added that many people in the village sold *krathom*. However, she denied any knowledge of the stash found at the train station.

She was taken to Chalerm Phrakiat District Police Station and charged with unauthorized possession, preparation and sale of a Class 5 substance.

Police are now hunting for the owner of the *krathom* seized at the railway station.

Pol Lt Col Pinphetch Chorkhong of the Border Patrol Police said that in the past the *krathom* was most commonly used unadulterated but now youths, especially in the three southernmost provinces, have begun to concoct narcotic mixtures by boiling the leaves with ingredients such as mosquito repellent, sleeping pills, cannabis and cough medicine, and then mixing the result with fizzy drinks.

A new perspective on photos

dding a new perspective to photography on Phuket, myClip Studio just south of Phuket City has introduced a new technology to the island – Foto Robot.

Foto Robot has a camera attached to a robot arm, which photographs a subject on a rotating platform.

Once the computer is programed to take the desired photos, the platform turns and the robot arm moves to take photos from almost any angle.

"Foto Robot is probably the best equipment that you can find right now. It can take pictures constantly, and we can set it to take pictures from zero to 90 degrees.

"Its 17-million megapixels allow us to blow a picture up to even billboard size," said Production Consultant Achirawit Churmung.

MyClip Studio in Phuket was originally a subsidiary of a company based in Munich, Germany.

The studio in Phuket, which opened about nine years ago, was relatively small until the head office decided recently to relocate its headquarters to the island.

It now has about 150 staffers offering complete around-theclock service, depending on the project; providing photography in fashion, fine art, weddings, events, portraits and more, and now the Foto Robot.

MyClip Studio is hoping its new machine will help take its

business to a much higher level. "There is heavy demand for photography in Phuket, it is time to take this opportunity and develop our skills, especially for Thailand.

"We started from nothing but we have a 'can do' mind set. We train our staff to improve their skills," said Managing Director Adul Inna.

The Foto Robot was ordered from the Czech Republic early

last year. It cost 60,000 euros (about 2.8 million baht). The studio sent several staff members to Germany for training in how to use the robot. The studio believes that they are the only studio currently using this machine in Phuket.

"Next time you buy things on the Internet it could be possible for you to see the goods from all directions. It could be on top, bottom, left or right, so you can have a better look before you decide to buy.

"Our customers are from Germany and South Korea and soon we will have a new market in Japan," said K. Achirawit.



t's not yet available – it should be brought to mar ket in late 2007 – but the Volkswagen Tiguan would appear to be an ideal vehicle for the roads and countryside of Phuket. Think of it as VW's answer to the Toyota RAV4. Only a great deal better.

Based on the highly successful Golf, the Tiguan, albeit still in concept form, was displayed at the Los Angeles Auto Show in November, where it received universal acclaim.

Inevitably known as a "small Touareg", Volkswagen's upmarket SUV, the new vehicle will feature all-wheel drive in most versions, while the model presented in Los Angeles featured a so-called "Clean TDI", a diesel engine of the next generation. In this unit Volkswagen says it employs a modular concept of different systems to significantly reduce emissions.

One of the systems includes a NOx (nitrogen oxides) storage catalytic converter, reducing the nitrogen oxides by up to 90% compared with existing engines. This unit, says VW, meets the strictest emissions standards in the world.

The Clean TDI introduced in the Tiguan is part of the

BLUETEC project initiated jointly by Audi, Mercedes-Benz and Volkswagen. The idea is to establish a concept of BLUETEC as a uniform label for clean and lowconsumption cars and SUVs with diesel engines. BLUE-

TEC complies with even the strictest US emissions regulations.

The technologies used and individually developed by each manufacturer serve to reduce nitrogen oxides in particular – the only exhaust components that lie above the rates of gasoline engines, due to the conceptual de-

sign of diesel engines.

The overall design of the Tiguan is distinctive and surpasses the rather bland appeal of the RAV4, although probably Toyota would disagree.

"It was very important to us to have the car appear powerful. Muscular. For us that had a higher priority than anything else," says Klaus Bischoff, head of design at Wolfsburg, Volkswagen's spiritual home and still its

headquarters. The Tiguan, its makers say, transfers the Touareg idea of a capable sedan and SUV into a different class.

Of modest proportions, the new vehicle is just 4.4 meters long and 1.69 meters high. There is a distinctive hood feeding into the headlamps, while broad, powerful bumpers beneath the headlamps are completed by matching fog lamps.

Popular concept

"An off-roader needs a long hood and an upright position," says Bischoff, "That lends the vehicle self-assuredness and power."

Viewed from the side, it is clearly related to the Touareg; it

is also immediately clear that this is a European design. The 19-inch alloy rims with low-profile tires add to the Tiguan's image of muscle. These are expected to be carried over to become a production reality later this year.

The interior is much as you would expect, with comfortable

seating for five, while the rear seat backs can be folded asymmetrically to offer versatile cargo space. Fully folded, objects up to 2.5 meters in length can be accommodated.

There is a large panoramic roof, a full 1.34 meters in length, affording a great deal of light to the passenger compartment and it is anticipated this will be standard on all but the entry-level model.

The concept car featured silver instruments and door handles, while there was also a great deal of orange. Production models are likely to be rather more subdued.

While currently the Tiguan is to be built in Germany, speculation prevails that it may eventually be produced in Puebla, Mexico, where the Beetle is made, due to the inherent weakness of the US dollar. North America, of course, will become a major market for the new SUV.

More details of the exact specification of the forthcoming Tiguan are expected in the first quarter of 2007 – probably at the Geneva Salon de l'Automobile in early March – but if the LA exhibit is anything to go by, it is undoubtedly an ideal prospect for these shores.



MESMERIZING MAY

It's hard to miss May and her fellow dancers on Soi Bangla. They draw the biggest crowds, to the point that it's sometimes hard to pass Soi Moulin Rouge without pushing through the throng. The tourists are mesmerized by their large-plumaged costumes and table-top dancing, whether they know the girls' secret or not. May is a fixture, and a part of the Bangla culture, but who is she? Zach Fridell went to find out.

Solution ince she was a child, Sulaiman "May" Chema knew she wanted to perform at a cabaret. When she saw the elaborate costumes, suggestive dance moves, beautiful makeup and lively atmosphere, she knew that's where she belonged. The only problem was that May was born a boy.

May never felt at home in her male body. She knew that she was a girl, and when she got the chance, she made sure the rest of the world could see her the way she felt.

Born to a Muslim family in the Deep South, May grew up in Haad Yai where the three cabaret shows in town grabbed her attention. She couldn't look or act like a girl while she was a student, but once she finished school

at age 15 she immediately began working for a local show. It was then that she started taking hormone therapy and began her transformation into a woman.

By the time she was 18, May had grown breasts. The hormones she still injects herself with every three days also give her soft, clear skin, she said, that she now protects by neither drinking nor smoking.

Her parents didn't initially approve of the vocation or the lifestyle May chose. They have yet to see one of her shows, but May said they are "about 80% okay with what I do, but not 100%." Because of that, she paid for all of her own hormone treatments and her parents know she's working at a bar in Phuket, but are under the impression that she's a waitress, said May.

When she visits her family, which she does about once a year, she wears her hair down and long – it would be hard to conceal – but dons no makeup and opts for T-shirt and jeans rather than her favored dresses.

"I look more like a boy when I wear those clothes," she explained, adding that it makes it more comfortable at home for both her and her parents. Back in Patong though, it's all business. May moved to Phuket seven years ago after some friends told her that the work was better than in Haad Yai. She now performs nightly at the Moulin Rose Cabaret at the end of Soi Moulin Rouge. Bedecked in sexy outfits, May and her fellow dancers put on a choreographed cabaret show every night.

To dance at the cabaret, May wakes up around 4 pm and starts putting on her makeup at 7 pm. Makeup, she said, takes only 10 minutes, then she is ready to work the crowds, preparing them for the first show at 9:30 pm. Other shows follow at 11 pm and 12:30 am.

May is one of the lead dancers in the show, lip-syncing popular songs while emulating the likes of Madonna and Britney Spears.

When she's not at work, May's favorite pastime is shopping for dresses and perfumes, but with only two days off a month, she doesn't have much time to herself, she said.

May said she is honest with men she meets about her status as a woman. She has never had surgery, and she does not intend to. Although some men have been surprised by her real gender, she said she has never suffered any violence against her by misguided men.

"I say to them, 'You know what I am? I am a ladyboy, not cut.' A couple of times men were surprised, when I thought they knew, but since I was never drunk it wasn't a problem."

She is also fluent in English, a language she started learning only when she came to Phuket. She has had several long-term boyfriends, including a Swiss man she saw for three years.

"But many men lie," she said. "They say 'I like you, I love you' but go home with another ladyboy, because I am too old."

At age 29, May repeatedly refers to herself as "old". She says she'll work at the cabaret as long as she can, but she doesn't have any plans beyond dancing.

"As long as I have enough energy, I have to work. When I can no longer dance, I will stop. But for now, at least, I have lots of energy," she said. "Maybe when I am 40 I will stop."

Until then, she dances on.





impractical – it won't solve the problem or make it go away.

In Thailand, one of the biggest problems is underage drinking. A former Interior Minister wanted to solve the problem of Thai youth drinking by closing down tourist venues. Finally the government of the time came up with zoning, except they didn't include Sukhumvit area, which is by far the biggest tourism spending area in Bangkok.

The next "solution" was to stop the stores from selling alcohol between 2 pm and 5 pm. This only happens in the big supermarkets, where school kids wanting to buy alcohol don't go anyway, so all this did was annoy the legitimate customers and cost the stores income. The small mom and pop stores all sell alcohol to anybody, anytime.

Then they came up with the idea of banning all alcohol advertising, thereby wiping out massive sports sponsorship [an irony in itself - Ed].

Surely, it would be more ef-

fective to increase taxes on alcohol and raise license fees, and use that money to set up a proper licensing branch with wellequipped squads that could enforce the law with all these stores.

Stores caught selling alcohol to minors should be fined heavily. This will not solve the problem but, to me, is the most effective way of reducing it.

A classic solution from this particular branch of government was to try to get the legal drinking age raised to 25, thereby creating another several million underage drinkers in one masterstroke.

This also would have effectively wiped out almost the entire nightclub industry, whose patrons average between 19 and 27 years, and about 30% of the tourism industry.

There was also the case of some young soldiers, who didn't really see why they should risk their lives to defend a country that wouldn't allow them to have a beer after the battle.

It really would be useful to have some people at the top who think things through before alarming everyone with some of these bird-brained ideas. Mind you, it could be worse, such as that South American country whose president seems to have decided that his friend Fidel was right after all and is now determined to kick his country back in to the dark ages of socialism and nationalization of 50 years ago.







t had been almost four years since my last trip to Lanta, and seeing that the island is now on the Tourism Authority of Thailand's (TAT) "emerging destination list" I thought it is time to check it out again.

So after an easy, three-anda-half hour drive from Phuket, the aging car ferry slowly departs the jetty carrying an assortment of pickup trucks, cars, motorcycles and returning school kids. We are on our way.

I am pleased to see that the island's dirt track roads are all paved, and despite the usual dust bowls, are at least passable. Take care, however, as they are narrow and busy with laden pickups and motorcycles.

The main village on the island – Saladan – is home to the island's main port and is very busy. As it is the main shopping and commercial area, it also houses all banks, supermarkets, bakeries and other businesses on the island.

For the first night, we decide to head away from the main tourist areas of the west coast to Lanta Old Town, home to Chinese merchants, Thai fishing families and a Sea Gypsy community – who have all lived in harmony for more than a century.

Today the same daily activities and traditional structures, including the markets, longtail fishing boats and Chinese shophouses built over the sea, remain as they did when the town served as one of Thailand's

busiest merchant hubs. The town is accessible by

is accessible by a small road that passes through the

center of the island. The road drops suddenly out of the hills and onto the small coastal plain, with its mangrove-covered coast and small farms.

Certainly worth a stop en route is the Viewpoint Restaurant, located high in the hills with

stunning views over the east coast and the islands in the distance. There are few tourists here, most of them being the blond, tanned Scandinavians who seem to be everywhere these days.

There is even an accredited Scandinavian school on the island, which caters to the ever-increasing number of long-stay tourists who want their kids' education to continue

new and interesting twist to home stay tourism. On arrival at the Old Town we are greeted by our friendly host, Khun Yu. The Mango House is the dream of Canadian resident Duane Lenni, who fell in love with this charming village and has been living on Lanta for the past three years. All Mango House buildings have been converted from 100year-old wooden Chinese shophouses, one of which formerly housed the local opium den.

The accommodation comprises three "over-the-sea" villas and two rooms located in the main

building. Large rooms with dark wood and rich silks provide simple yet elegant comfort, with views overlooking local street life.

The villas built over the sea offer stunning sea views and allow travelers to experience life in a small southern Thai fishing village. This place is unique and well worth a few nights' stay.

Beyond the Mango Bar and Bistro, which serves Thai and Western favorites, there are two dining options: Beautiful Seafood or Fresh Seafood, both actual names of the only two eateries in this sleepy village.

Beauty won on this occasion. Seated in an over-the-sea sala at the restaurant, we are served some excellent local cuisine by Khun Kai, one of the most attentive and friendliest waiters we've met for a while.

After dinner we retire for the night. The village sleeps early, too – no night life here. And late risers beware, the locals get going just after dawn, so an early night is certainly encouraged.

The next day we head across to the west coast and that evening end up sharing a bottle of Pastis with my old friend Frank, General Manager of the Pimalai Resort.

The resort has now expanded, and even if you don't stay there at least head for the resort's stunning new restaurant, The Seven Seas, located high in the hills overlooking across the resort's secluded beach.

The restaurant is spectacular, especially with its sunset views and fine dining. The few glasses of excellent Pastis are wonderful, too. Thanks Frank, hope to see you again real soon.

By car: Drive through Krabi and head south on Highway 4 toward Trang. After Huay Nam Khao turn right onto Route 4206 and follow the signs to Koh Lanta – Ferry. The drive from Phuket to the jetty takes about 3**D** hours.

By ferry: Take the new hydrofoil ferry service from Kon-Tiki Divers, which departs Phuket Port daily at 8:30 am, and travels to Phi Phi Island and then onto Koh Lanta. Cost: 1,400 baht one-way. oddy Doyle was a high school English teacher in Dublin when he found his literary voice with three thin, screamingly funny novels - The Commitments, The Van, and The Snapper - a trilogy about a sharp-witted, foulmouthed, working-class Dublin family.

He followed this up with a heartbreaking novel, told from the perspective of a child who is watching his parents break up, Paddy Clark Ha Ha Ha. This most deservedly won the Booker Prize.

His tone turned even more sombre with The Woman Who Walked Into Doors told in the voice of Paula Spencer, the alcoholic battered wife of a violent drunk.

Paula Spencer (Jonathan Cape, London, 2006, 277pp) is back now in this eponymous novel.


Her husband's been dead for nearly a decade. She's 48 years old, still a cleaning woman, and sober for four months and five days. Her elder daughter, Nicola, is a success, her elder son, John Paul, a recovering heroin addict.

The two youngest, Leanne, 22, and Jack, 17, still live at home with her. Leanne shows signs of turning into an alcoholic herself. They've all been damaged by a violent family history. Paula is trying to make up for it day by day.

Dublin has changed too in the last 10 years. Ireland has become the "Celtic Tiger". Paula is paid in euros.

She takes solace in a newly opened Italian cafe. All the cashiers in the local supermarket are Nigerian women. Her next door neighbors are Polish. The office

cleaners she now supervises are Romanian and Bulgarian men.

She uses a mobile phone and sends text messages. She's saving to buy her son a computer for Christmas.

The local Christian Brothers school is no longer staffed by Christian Brothers: "They're all dead or in jail".

This is a tale told in short,

plodding sentences, just as Paula lives her life:

"She's on her way home from work. She's walking from the station. There's no energy in her. Nothing in her legs. Just pain. Ache. The thing the drink gets down to.

"But the drink is only part of it. She's coped well with the drink. She wants a drink. She doesn't want a drink. She doesn't want a drink. She fights it. She wins. She's proud of that. She's pleased. She'll keep going. She knows she will."

You would think 277 pages of this would soon grow boring, and the endless litany of complaint does indeed grow tiresome at times, but what holds this novel together is the fierce sense of family shot through with brilliant flashes of comic dialog.

Paula is trying to knit together her fractious family while constantly tormented by flashes of painful memory:

"She hates Christmas. She always has – or since she was a few years married and she realized she was poor and she was always going to be . . . She remembers going through the supermarket with a trolley full of six-packs and mixers and the rest. She couldn't make the trolley go straight. Jack was in the carrier part. She was afraid the whole thing was going to topple over. Leanne was pulling on the other side of it, asking for every biscuit and family pack they passed. And she actually - did she? - she smacked Leanne, until she let go of the trolley. She tried to smile through the whole thing, piling the stuff onto the conveyor. She threw a few bars of chocolate



onto the pile, to make it look more normal, the expensive black chocolate kids don't even like, and Jack was trying to climb out and Leanne was snuffling and refusing to look at her. A chicken instead of a turkey and four bottles of vodka on the table. This was Christmas."

The comic highpoints of the novel are the gab sessions among Paula and her two raucous sisters, Carmel and Denise. The married Denise confesses to an affair with a married man and this leads to 20 pages of ferociously bawdy dialog. In a later session, Carmel even wrings desperate humor out of her diagnosis of breast cancer. The family is indomitable.

The novel ends a year later with Paula still sober. She's even met a man. You root for her all the way.



A sounding off that deserves to be heard

After sending a vehicle in for mechanical adjustments or retrofitting, a car owner is justified in asking the garage owner for a chance to test drive the vehicle to ensure everything is in proper working order before paying the bill.

In the case of Patong's tsunami warning system, however, that test drive has not taken place. According to allegations by several members of the consortium that donated the first three towers, the system has been modified and may not work properly following adjustments to it by a rival firm that won a government contract to construct 62 more tsunami towers in the region [see Inside Story, pages 4 and 5].

Determining the extent to which these claims represent a valid concern for public safety – or stem from a case of corporate "sour grapes" – will have to be determined by technical and legal experts.

The fact remains, however, that the Patong system hasn't been audibly tested since April 2005. Such a test is overdue, especially since the system was modified by a company different from the one that designed and installed it.

Dr Smith Dharmasaraja, who heads the National Disaster Warning Center (NDWC), says the sirens should be fully tested every four to six months, but that local authorities fear creating a panic during the peak of the high season for tourism.

The *Gazette*'s stance is that in order to maintain public confidence in the face of such allegations, the system should be tested as soon as possible. More frequent testing is also needed to ensure that the public is familiar with the sounds the sirens emit.

This is particularly true in Patong, with so many tourists, thumping sound systems, sound trucks and other contributors to the cacophony.

Patong was spared from a much larger loss of human life on December 26, 2004, by the fact that the tsunami hit in the morning, when the beach was relatively empty. Should another tsunami strike Phuket, Patong might not be so lucky.

Despite all the fanfare, the single direct-detection buoy now sitting at the middle of the Indian Ocean will afford Phuket little or no protection. By the time it detects a tsunami wave produced by an earthquake along the Sunda Trench, another wave propagating eastward will already be bearing down on our island.

Given this fact, it is crucial that any warning the NDWC sends out be heard and acted upon as soon as possible. To be sure that will happen in Patong, the warning towers there must be put through regular, thorough testing. – The Editor

Wishlist for Patong

'e send all the garbage Patong Municipality collects to the incinerator in Phuket City, where we have to pay 200 baht per ton, I think, to have it burned. In Patong now, in the high season, we have about 80 tons per day.

I have talked to people who work for the Governor's office and complained that it isn't fair, because they only support us based on the registered population of the municipality, which is about 16,000 people. How many more people are unregistered? Probably about 100,000. And how many tourists?

So we have a lot of garbage, and we have to collect it every day. My staff are tired. They never have a day off. They have to work every single day, even New Year's Day, Saturdays and Sundays. They work 24 hours

For many tourists, Patong is the first impression they have of Thailand, so we have to keep it clean, even though our staff are sometimes very, very tired.

I try my best, but sometimes business people in Patong get angry with me, even for putting up announcements asking for a public hearing so we can ask them when is a good time to collect their garbage.

It really should be easy. I ask what time is good for them, not for us. I give them many choices, especially along Soi Bangla and Thaweewong Rd. I would like those roads to be very clean, because there are pedestrian areas.

They select the times - once in the morning, then at six in the evening – but they still don't put out their trash at those times, so we have to go collect it every two hours. We collect at 10 pm, midnight, 2 am and 6 am.

But then there is the problem that many, many people who live in other areas, such as Phuket City, come and go through the garbage to remove items for recycling. The people who put the rubbish out for collection have already bagged their trash properly, but these people come with a knife and cut open the garbage bags. This is very bad.

When I catch them in the act I say 'Don't do that, you're making it very difficult for my staff.' Then they complain, saying I am not helping the poor people. I understand they are poor, but they should still do the right thing. If you don't teach them what to do, they just do whatever they want.

Many of these people are not Thai. There are Burmese and Cambodians too, and many of them don't even live in Patong. They come over in a *salaeng* (motorbike with sidecar), cut open the bags and leave a big mess.

As for the mess at the end of Nanai Soi 2, that is private land. They put all the garbage back there and sometimes they try to burn it, which makes a bad smell that bothers people. I have tried to stop them many times already.



FIRST PERSON

Patong Deputy Mayor Chairat Sukkaban has a lot on his hands, with one of his major responsibilities being keeping up the appearances of Patong. Better garbage collection, moving power cables underground and clamping down on noisy promoters are just a few of the proposed solutions, but to achieve these he says he needs the help of business

owners and additional government funds. Here he explains what he would like to achieve in Patong and why.

Advertising is a big problem too. People put up posters everywhere - on power poles, on telephone booths. I tell my staff to pull them down from places like that and the advertisers get angry with me, saying that I am trying to persecute them and their businesses.

Another thing I don't like is the boxing advertising, such as 'Tonight! Tonight!' I get a lot of complaints about this from tourists. The [promoters] pay a tax, so they have permission to advertise, but they are only allowed to do it from 10 am to 6 pm, and not so loudly.

It's not only boxing. You have Rock City, Saxophone, all these people. Even Jungceylon and Central Festival do it. The sound trucks cause traffic congestion, too.

I was not born here, but I have lived here almost 30 years. My job is dangerous, because some of these people are aggressive. My mom asks me, "Why do you want to die early?" There are

many problems in Patong. My god, I am getting a lot of gray hairs. My aunt told me, "You used to be good looking, but now after two-and-half years in this job you look very old." [laughs]

I say, "I can't help it. I have already come so far, so now I have to finish the job." But I can't do it alone. There are so many problems, but we have had some successes too. For the environment, we have ISO 14001 certification; we are the only town in the south of Thailand that has it.

One month ago I took 10 of my staff, my boss's secretary and the rest of the team to Singapore. I wanted them to spend a weekend there to see how clean it is.

Another reason I took my staff [to Singapore] was to see how the electricity supply is done there. In Patong there are electric wires hanging down everywhere. It looks bad and it's dangerous.

We had a plan to install them underground, but after Thaksin didn't win any MPs in the election, he didn't support it. Before he wanted to support it, but he didn't after that.

Here in Patong we make a lot of money for the country, but we don't get the support we need from the central government. They must do better. If they support us with the infrastructure, Patong will look a lot better. It would cost a lot, but it is a onetime investment and one that would benefit the country in the long run.

What can I do about a noisy karaoke?

I live near Rung Arun Karaoke, opposite Soi Thanuthep, on Chao Fa East Rd. The karaoke stays open every night until 1:30 am or 2 am. It is just a wooden hut, so the loud music carries throughout the whole neighborhood.

My kids go to school early in the morning and so need their sleep, as do the elderly and the sick people who live nearby.

How can a karaoke, 800 meters from Chalong Police Station, be so noisy and be allowed to operate so late?

Sleepless in Chalong

Pol Col Chalit Kaewyarat, Superintendent, Chalong Police Station, replies:

Before issuing permits to entertainment venues, the provincial authority must inspect entertainment venues to verify whether or not they comply with the law.

If the venue disturbs people in the neighborhood, people can file a complaint with the police. However, the complaint must be filed in person. You are welcome to join us when we investigate your complaint.

Thank you for informing us. We always keep an ear out for noisy venues that disturb other people. If we find that the noise is too loud, we will notify the entertainment venue owner that he or she must reduce the noise being created or improve the building so that the noise is contained.

If the owner does not comply, he or she will be fined up to 1,000 baht per offence.

Wanlapa Jeenloy, an officer at the Phuket Provincial Public Health Office, replies:

By law, the noise should not reach more than 90 decibels for more than eight continual hours. But it's quite difficult to measure how disturbing the noise is, because noise affects many different kinds of people in different

ways. For example, a house where patients, old people or children live might not be able to bear loud noise for long periods of time.

If the noise is very disturbing, people can file a complaint at the local administration office or at the local police station, and the officers will then instruct the entertainment venue to make improvements, such as improving the sound insulation.

The local officers might have a public hearing for people in the area and then send the entertainment venue a notice to decrease the noise created.

If the venue does not comply the police can fine the venue, and possibly have the venue ordered closed, but it might take time for police to do that.

'Private beaches' in Thailand?

Recently I tried to go to Karon Noi Beach, between Karon and Patong

A hundred meters or so along what I thought was the access road I was stopped at a checkpoint. The uniformed guard there told me that it was a private road leading to private beacn that belongs to Le Meridien Phuket Beach resort.

I have been told by local people that this is not true and that the hotel has decided to make it their own private beach, when in fact it is a public beach. What is the true situation?



• Planned action. Thai travel agents complain, development has gone too far. Like so many destinations, we overdevelop without thinking. Responsible master planning is the answer. Except for North Phuket, that means full-stop on development around the Gulf of Phuket.

Tourists don't come to see beautiful islands tainted by overdevelopment. They move on to another of the world's 200 tropical destinations. We can't force their vacation decisions, but we can offer good planning balancing economics and natural beauty.

• The Battle For Koh Yao. The hotel plots are sold but all is not lost if Koh Yao is developed thoughtfully. But will you bet money on responsible, low impact development?

Koyao Island Resort can't be seen from the sea, blends with the local culture and doesn't use aircon, but the mainstream resorts built and under construction are typical mainstream on an island that isn't. The first mainstream hotel mishandled local relations in almost every way possible, setting a sad stage for future development. The second resort has typically large infrastructure.

Let's hope future developers do a better job of blending with the island's sleepy culture and beautiful topography.

What comes next? With thoughtful creativity, we can balance development with economic benefit. But with we must put more effort into realistic planning driven by reality, not corruption and short-term thinking.

Time is getting short. Phuket is still a beautiful place – let's keep it that way.

Which Vista is which? KHUN WOODY'S COMPUTER

indows Vista will launch on January 29, at a gala ceremony in New York. Boxes of Vista and Microsoft Office 2007 should be widely available worldwide shortly after.

My first Vista book, Windows Vista All-In-One Desk Reference For Dummies, hit the stands just before Christmas, and promptly sold out. The second printing will be on store shelves in North America and Europe by the time you read this.

Last week I wrote about the "Time Stopper" cracked version of Vista, which was widely available in Bangkok in mid-December. Microsoft has fixed that crack and no new pirate versions seem imminent – but you never know, eh? Chances are good that, if you want Vista, you'll have to pay for it.

Blech.

Unfortunately, Vista comes in eight different versions. Fortunately, choosing among the versions isn't as difficult as it first appears:

Windows Starter 2007 (Microsoft won't even call it "Vista"), like Windows XP Starter Edition, is available only in specific developing countries, where the price of Vista generally exceeds the country's average monthly gross income.

The concept of a "starter" edition of Windows originated in Thailand, and it's likely that we'll see one here. The starter edition will come only bundled with new computers - and it's so restrictive that I bet almost everyone who gets it will waste no time at all wiping it off their hard drives.

Vista Home Basic Edition is directed at first-time home computer users who are looking for a

bargain. In my books, I call this the "Bait and Switch Edition". Microsoft created it to keep the price of cut-rate consumer PCs deceptively low.

When you decide that you can't live with the bare bones – you don't even get the new "Aero Glass" interface, for heaven's sake - Home Basic gives you the, uh, opportunity to buy an upgrade to Home Premium – the version you should've bought in the first place.

All it takes is a credit card. Microsoft gives you a new key, and that's it: no new CD, no new box, nothing. The new key unlocks the Home Premium bits that are already on your hard drive. Leave it to Microsoft to find yet another way to milk that old cash cow.

Vista Home N matches Home Basic, except Windows Media Player has been

removed. Microsoft only makes this version to comply with EU restrictions.

Vista Home Premium Edition has all the features home users want and need, as well as many features that appeal to folks with small businesses. It includes Windows Media

Center, which was a separate product under Windows XP. Unless you're fabulously wealthy and don't mind opening a vein to buy Vista Ultimate, this is the version you want.

Vista Business Edition aims for small business users - those

who work for companies without computer departments - who have no interest in the fun side of PCs. Really. There's no Media Center, no DVD video burning and no Photo Gallery, among other restrictions.

Vista Business N includes everything in the Business Edition, except for Windows Media Player. I think Microsoft plans to sell two copies of this version, both to EU litigators.

Vista Enterprise Edition has all of the extra bells and whistles needed to attach the PC to a large corporate netsometime later

this year, you will want to get Vista Enterprise.

Vista Ultimate includes everything in both the Home Premium and Enterprise Editions, plus extra goodies that may change from time to time. So far, the only goodies that have been announced are Hold 'em

Poker (I don't make these names up...), a "really cool" utility for using movies as Windows wallpaper (I swear I don't make this stuff up) and a program that makes it possible to run BitLocker drive encryption on the hard drive you use to boot up.

n my column in the Novem ber 18, 2006 issue of the Gazette, I pointed out, as in previous articles, that it is safer to use the "cocktail" approach to invest in Asia, and investors in Asian equities using the "cocktail" approach found 2006 to be a very profitable year.

Singapore reached new record highs as did the Hong Kong and Chinese stock markets. India also pushed strongly, after a mid-year correction and broke new records. Japan disappointed, yet still made the highest closing in years.

However, the big question in Asian investment still remains: whether to include Japan in an Asia fund or exclude it. In reality, because of the size of the Japanese stock market, almost every fund that invests in the region allocates 40% of more of the assets to Japan.

The fund industry, when it comes to equities, is measured by indexes. Whether a fund manager follows the Morgan Stanley or Financial Times (FT) indexes, or those of any other group, has to be legally declared. The two measurements of any funds are how well it performed compared with its benchmark index and how well it performed against its peers.

The fund industry is competitive and aware that superior investment performance brings in more assets and profits. The reverse also holds true. For the investor the choice is simply to use a fund that includes or excludes

Japan. Often, the same investment house will offer both options.

Long-established fund management group JF offers an Eastern Fund that excludes Japan, and a Pacific Securities Trust that includes Japan. Investors can hold both funds or use any combination of other investment houses.

The investment strategy is going to vary for each investor.

Quality in products

Many people choose not to invest in Asia, and a significant number are reluctant to enter markets anywhere.

The massive shakeout of most of the world's stock markets from 2000 to 2003 resulted in many investors viewing stock markets as risky assets in their portfolios.

The Thai stock market is a small player in terms of "market capitalization". Few foreign asset managers have large investments in Thailand; it is usually a small component in an Asian fund, maybe 1% to 2%. Therefore, regional and even global funds that are exposed to the Thai market

feel very little of its impact on their overall performance.

Thus, in the 1997 Asian financial crisis, broader ranging funds easily outperformed funds that targeted only Thailand. It is a small market and this adds to its volatility; thinly-traded markets react more strongly to intraday pressure than their larger brethren.

The technical foundation of the Thai stock market is attractive, Price Earning Ratios (PE) at just over eight are very cheap. However, at least in the short term, there are too many political and economic problems for this market to move ahead.

Capital controls are also having a strongly negative effect. For example, an island resident transferred about 900,000 baht from his overseas bank to invest in the Thai stock market. The transfer was initiated before the new year; the funds arrived in Thailand at the beginning of Jan-

The individual had the Bangkok head office of a large Thai bank call me to negotiate on his behalf. The bank's position was that the client should already have documentation in Thailand to substantiate his investment.

The individual intended to invest the capital via a "SET Index Tracker" fund run by another major Thai bank. The bombing in Bangkok caused the stock market to fall and the client wanted the market to settle before placing a buying order.

The head office of this Thai bank did not fully understand the issue. The staffer who called me had to continually refer to higher authority as she herself had no answers to my questions. Eventually, the bank maintained that 30% of the money was to be deposited with the Bank of Thailand in a zero-interest deposit for one year. The individual simply reversed the investment.

These recently enacted regulations are supposed to encourage stock market investment; the reality is that they are hurting it. Bloomberg quoted credit rating agency Standard & Poors on January 8, 2007: "Thailand's business conditions worsening".

Seaplane company set for take-off in Phuket

PHUKET: Destination Air will become the only operating seaplane company in Thailand when it launches an air shuttle service 12 times a day from Phuket International Airport on February 1.

The company, trading under the name Destination Air Shuttle, will begin flights to Ranong, the Phi Phi Islands, Krabi, Koh Lanta and Koh Mook (Trang), with flights departing Phuket Airport every two hours.

The company plans to expand services from October 2007 through to May 2008 to include the Similans, Koh Racha, Khao Lak and mainland Trang.

Amante C. Amante Jr, Director of Corporate Communications for parent company Destination Properties Co Ltd, told the Gazette that Destination Air Shuttle "will connect with the international airlines by providing door-to-door service to most major hotels and resorts on various islands when guests arrive on Phuket.

"It will reduces the travel time to these resort destinations from the usual half-day overland trip to less than 13 minutes to Phi Phi, 20 minutes to Krabi and 30 minutes to Koh Lanta.

"We are also working with hospital groups to provide emergency service in the future. With this cooperation, if a tourist has an accident around the island, doing diving or water activities, for example, we can immediately pick them up and take them to a hospital in Phuket."

Destination Air has invested US\$3 million (about 108 million baht) in the operation and bought two Cessna seaplanes from North America. "We plan to in-crease that to six planes within this year." Mr Amante said...

Passengers will board one

of Destination Air Shuttle's amphibian aircraft that take off from the runway and land in front of their island resort," he added.

'Destination Air's fleet includes Cessna 208 and 206 aircraft, which are rated as the safest light aircraft in the world and can accommodate four to eight passenger seats.

"Our aircraft are flown by experienced international foreign pilots," Mr Amante said. Tickets will cost between

6,000 baht and 7,000 baht each way.

Destination Air will also offer day trips snorkeling off the Phi Phi Islands, with the package costing about 20,000 baht per person.

Destination Air will be the third company to launch a seaplane shuttle service in Phuket.

The most recent, Blue Water Air ceased operations about two years ago, though not because of the tsunami.



Thailand's best boxers in 2006

ast year was Pongsak-lek Wonjongkam's year. He racked up four title defenses, broke the record for consecutive title defenses by a flyweight and successfully made his 16th straight defense in November.

Former champion Yodsanan Sor Nanthachai stayed busy against

decent opponents while Sirimongkol Singwancha fought just twice, both times against fighters who had little chance of winning.

Poonsawat Kratingdaenggym came up short against Vladimir Sidorenko in his bantamweight title fight and Veeraphol Sahaprom was starched in nine by Japan's Hozumi Hasegawa in their rematch.

Wandee Singwancha won the WBC's light-flyweight interim title, then promptly lost it on the scales in his next fight.

Somsak Sithchatchawal made it to the top of the mountain when he defeated Mahyar Monshipour, only to be sent crashing three rounds later by Celestino Caballero.

Grizzled veteran Ratanachai Sor Vorapin came back from his November 2005 loss to Jhonny Gonzalez to win all four of his fights in 2006.

Another female prisoner failed in her bid to win a world title and in doing so had her life story chronicled in a movie, *Fight for Freedom*. She'll get another crack at a title early next year.

Thai Fighter of the Year: Wonjongkam (63-2, 31 KOs) hasn't lost for 10 years and is Thailand's lone world champion. No active Thai fighter comes close to besting Wonjongkam's accomplishments so he is my pick

for Thailand's fighter of the year.

Wonjongkam defeated South African fighter Monelisi Myekeni in November to make his 16th successful title defense in a row, and he plans to make four more before retiring.

He needs a marquee fight or two in order to be considered among the division's all-time greats and may get his chance late in 2007 if a rumored bout with Vic Darchinyan comes to fruition.

Thai Promoter of the Year: Virat Vajiratanawongse – how can you not give him the award? He's guided the career of Wonjongkam and has another flyweight, Panomroonglek Kratingdaenggym, waiting in the wings to take over the flyweight championship once Wonjongkam calls it quits.





Fight of the Year: Sithchatchawal vs. Monshipour – The bout wasn't high profile, but it was high energy and high drama: my runaway pick for fight of the year.

Gutsiest Performance: Sithchatchawal – in the fight of the year with Monshipour. Although hurt several times throughout the bout, he stayed upright long enough to finish Monshipour in the 10th round. What a fight!

Mismatch of the Year: Sirimongkol Singwancha (54-2, 32 KOs) vs. Lito Gonzaga (24-24-1, 8 KOs).

S Singwancha is a former WBC Bantamweight and Super Featherweight belt holder. Gonzaga had dropped 13 of his last 14 fights and had only fought once in eight years. He did not belong in the ring with S Singwancha, period. The Games and Amusement Board had not issued a letter of clearance for Gonzaga allowing him to engage in the bout, yet the Thai promoter and matchmaker went ahead with the fight.

Gonzaga was disposed of in three rounds. When asked about the bout, one WBC official stated, "It was really just a sparring session. It wasn't even like Singwancha went at it with him."

Despite that, it was an official bout and not an exhibition. Need I say more?

Fortunately and to his credit, Singwancha didn't totally obliterate the Filipino, but it's unlikely this bout would have ever made it past a boxing commission in the US, the UK or the Philippines.



Upset of the Year: Lito Sisnorio (5-3-1, 2 KOs) TKO5 Fahpetchnoi Sor Chitpattana (13-1, 9 KOs).

Ranked fifth by the WBC at the time, undefeated flyweight and WBC Youth title holder Sor Chitpattana of Thailand met unranked Filipino Sisnoria in what was expected to be an easy win for the Thai.

Sisnorio came with guns blazing in round one and promptly dropped Sor Chitpattana. He put him down again in round two and for the third and final time in round five.

The fifth ranked-flyweight in the world (the WBC's that is) had just been destroyed.

Sor Chitpattana dropped to the WBC's 11th spot while Sisnoria moved to 21st. The Thai has yet to fight since losing the contest and is currently ranked eighth by the WBC.

Most Overrated: Kratingdaenggym (15-0, 8 KOs) and Prawet Singwancha (30-2-1, 18 KOs).

Kratingdaenggym is somehow rated first by the WBC. Out of his 15wins, he's beaten three fighters with winning records. Three, count-em. He's beaten no one ranked in the top 20 but is somehow worthy of the WBC's number one spot. What would justify him being ranked first?

P Singwancha, rated number one in the lightweight division by the WBA, has somehow managed to wangle a shot at Juan Diaz's title in February. He is unranked by *Ring Magazine* and *Fight News* and is ranked 98th by BoxRec.

He holds victories over Dennis Laurente and Nonoy Gonzalez, which means very little unless you're on the WBA's rating committee. If you consider winning the PABA title deserving, then you can somehow justify his number one ranking.

Where Is He Now Award: Ratanachai Sor Vorapin – He's still fighting and has won his last four fights, all by KO, but is a ringworn 30 years old. His clock is ticking and with 75 fights already on his ledger, 2007 is a make-orbreak year.

Asian Fighter of the Year: Pacquiao: He's not Thai but Pacquiao may very well deserve the top pound-for-pound spot and is undoubtedly the top fighter in Asia.

He's got a host of sensational bouts ahead of him; Barerra, Marquez, Valero and he looks to provide fans at least a few more years before calling it quits.

Sharks to defend Rugby Tens title

KARON: The Fifteen 7 Sharks from the UK have confirmed they will be back in Phuket to defend their title as Phuket International Rugby Tens champions at this year's event, to be held at Karon Municipal Stadium May 26 and 27.

Also confirmed to return are last year's runners-up Moorabin Rams, who this year will play under the name Melbourne Rams.

In addition, 14 other teams out of a possible maximum of 24 have confirmed or have reserved to play in the tourney, which is in its ninth year, in hope of lifting the Clive Williamson Memorial Trophy. They are: Phuket Vagabonds RFC and British Club Bangkok; The Bucks from Singapore; Dubai Hurricanes, Bahrain RFC and The Frogs Dubai (United Arab Emirates); Shanghai Hairy Crabs (China); the Pot Bellied Pigs and Old Bill (Hong Kong); Doha RFC (Qatar); Arabian Gulf Vets and Penang All Blues.

Two teams to watch out for this year, said tourney organizer Patrick Cotter, are Aussie Armed Services, which will comprise players from the Australian Army, Navy and Air Force squads, and Devon RFC.

"We will also be running the 'coffin dodgers' old boys' tens competition during the weekend. We have had a lot of interest in this as players get older and slower, so we may have to start proceeding with that competition on the Friday afternoon, depending on the number of teams," Cotter said.

Already signed up to take part are Phuket Viagrabonds, Magnificent Oldies Rugbeerers from Malaysia, Bangkok Bangers, Ye Old Gulls from Australia, Bahrain RFC, Arabian Gulf with the aim of continuing the scholarship program, which is

Construction Update

Kan Eang gets B20m makeover

CHALONG: Construction work underway since May last year at Kan Eang 1 restaurant in Chalong - one of the island's longest-serving seafood restaurants - is almost complete and is scheduled to reopen under the name Kan Eang @ Pier next month.

Wallee Pachantabutr, Director of Phuket Kan Eang said that the improvements are necessary to keep up with the growth of tourism in Phuket.

"We have been rebuilding the Kan Eang 1 restaurant since May last year. We have just extended the land lease for another 25 years, so we decided to beautify the restaurant as well," she said.

'The Pachantabutr family, led by my husband K. Chamnan, ran Kan Eang 1 restaurant for more than 30 years and Kan Eang 2 for about 25 years. Kan Eang means 'feel at ease' and we started out as a simple local Phuket restaurant beside Chalong Pier.

"We buy fish and other seafood from local fisherman and we sell freshly-prepared seafood dishes back to local people," she said.

All the old buildings on the 3¹/₂-rai plot have been demolished, and the 20-million-baht redevelopment will see the introduction of the Bay Bar, the K1 Kaffé coffee shop and a souvenir shop measuring nine meters by 12m called "SSS".

"The Bay Bar will have a terrace for up to 20 people to enjoy cocktails or other drinks and snacks on, and will be open from 11 am to 1 am. K1 Kaffé, will be open from 6:30 am to 1 am to serve tourists taking boats from the pier, or anyone else wanting a simple breakfast, lunch or din-

ner here," K. Wallee explained.

At the main entrance will be a sala displaying live fish, lobsters, shrimp and crabs from which guests can order their meals. Next to this will be another sala, this one displaying wine from Wine Connection in Chalong.

A third sala will feature displays about local Phuket food. Yet another sala will be des-

Another pavilion of similar dimensions will serve as another dining area.



ecorating a child's room is an ongoing task. It's important to do, but it can be tricky to get the right balance of size and maturity. Before long, it's time to move from baby bed with pink and white to a full-size bed with posters of Tata Young.

For a small child's room, safety, not color and style, should be the main concern. Paritchawan Kraiponrak, the Furniture Buyer-Product Manager at Courts Megastore, recommends, "When buying a bedroom set for children, parents should try to select something functional to match the personality of the child.

"Our bestselling furniture is in neutral colors, either brown or dark colors, because most parents want to be able to use the same furniture until the children are older.


Mr Ludecke adds, "It's also important that the cabinet and bed are not too big and not too small," so that it is easy for children to use and not dangerously oversized.

Idling among the alders

'm all for the easy life. Some would even call me idle. Anything that involves physical effort is just a little too much. I've never quite understood why people would ever want to do more work than they needed to.

I have to admit that I'm a bit of a gadget man; anything to pander to my idle side and make life a little bit easier. Electric toothbrushes are superb – they even do a decent job when you come home from the pub a little the worse for wear.

I even came across a battery-operated, remote-control drink caddy recently. How much better can it get than a machine that brings your beer to you? The downside is that you have to be in a pool (it's inflatable, and only works on water), and someone else has to take the beer out of the fridge and put it in the caddy. Hopefully the second version will have wheels and a fridge-dooropening-and-take-beer-out-offridge attachment.

Casting my mind back to my childhood, I recall that eating an ice cream cone was often a sticky, messy affair. It was made far more sticky and messy if I didn't remember to turn the cone on time, and lick the other side, as it were. Tropical heat introduces equally perilous ice cream hazards, which is where the automated ice cream turner comes in. All you have to do is lick. Sorry for sounding like one of those cheesy infomercials, but there's more. Those electric fly swatter things that look like cheap little tennis rackets are brilliant. Rather that having to expend hundreds of kilojoules of energy by wafting a daft little plastic swatter around trying to bring about the demise of one irritating mosquito, wave this thing in the air and just wait for it to come to you.

Why would you want to bother swatting at bugs when you can electrocute them? That "zap" noise is particularly satisfying, and you can put the saved energy to much more sensible use by lifting a beer to your mouth.

Then there's the body drier. Sopping towels and elbow cramps could be a thing of the past with the ceiling-mounted, remote-controlled body dryer – this has to be the future of unbridled idleness.

Some gadgets I don't understand, though. The Segway is a good example. It's basically a pair of wheels with a handle, which you stand on and it moves. I just don't get it. Am I supposed to believe that standing up, balancing and pushing a big handle is going to be easier than walking? I'd far rather get on a motorcycle; at least I can sit down while traveling from A to B.

A popular dining experience in Asia involves going to a restaurant, telling a waitress what raw ingredients take your fancy,

then putting them all in a big pot in the middle and doing the job yourself. Why?

It's the same with gardening. There are those types around who like to make life as difficult for themselves as they possibly can. They choose the most fickle plants that require the most precise conditions and treatment.

Not me, given my relatively high score on the idleness chart. First, if it's an ugly plant, it's out. If it behaves like a grumpy old woman if it doesn't receive just the right amount of sympathy on demand then it's also a plant that won't be in a Bert garden.

The best plants for me pretty much look after themselves. About the one concession I will make is watering. At least that doesn't require any expenditure of energy beyond pointing the hose in the right direction once a day.

One of my favorite self-sufficient plants is the yellow alder, or *baan chao* in Thai. It's not the most spectacular plant in the world, but it really is perfect for

the idle gardener, as water is all it needs. Other than that it will pretty much look after itself.

Its dark green foliage sets off the bright yellow flowers, which are produced on a daily basis. The blooms are normally 5 to 6 centimeters across and the compact, woody shrub can reach up to about a meter tall.

It can do several jobs in the garden. It does very well in mass plantings, as a border or hedge, or as ground cover. The yellow alder can become a bit straggly and leggy if it isn't pruned fairly regularly, but unlike many other plants it will bloom without pruning anyway.

The yellow alder seems to grow best in full sun. Its ability to withstand high temperatures means that it's perfectly suited to Phuket island life. Even the soil doesn't really matter. It will put up with most soil types, from sand to loam and clay. About the only request it will make is good drainage.

The yellow alder has got it all worked out. The bright yellow flowers only appear during the day, when the insects they attract (there's one in the picture) can do their job. There's no point in staying open at night, so they don't bother. By early evening you're unlikely to see a yellow alder with its flowers open – they're far more likely to have shriveled up to virtually nothing by that time of day.

According to the experts, the yellow alder is "propagated by seed, cuttings or division". Here in Thailand, you really don't need to bother with any of those methods. Just leave it. Do absolutely nothing apart from giving it plenty of water.

In no time at all you'll have a number of smaller seedlings appearing nearby. I had one of these in a pot, and no nearby pot was safe from its desire to reproduce. Initially I just thought that it was an area of the garden that was especially prone to weeds, until I missed one of them for a couple of weeks and it turned out to be a brand new yellow alder. In other parts of the world they require careful nurturing and tender care - here they reproduce like hyperactive rabbits. There's no stopping them.

To get started though, you'll need some initial plants. Go down to your local garden center and ask for a few *baan chao*. This is certainly not the most expensive plant in the world; presumably the price is an indication of how ludicrously easy they are to grow. Believe it or not, a 30cm tall specimen will set you back the grand total of 10 baht.

Gardening with the minimum of effort that costs next to nothing financially either; how much better can it get? Time for another beer. Now where's that remote control so I can summon up the electric beer trolley...
