Tuk-tuks protest new traffic flow

PATONG: About 40 angry tuktuk drivers parked their vehicles on the football field on the beach road from 5 pm until 10 pm on January 21 to protest the town's new one-way road system, which went into effect on a three-month trial basis just a week earlier.

Among the drivers' complaints are that the new system has increased traffic, travel time and operating costs – while decreasing profits of many local businesses that have lost passing trade.

An urgent meeting, chaired by Phuket Vice-Governor Tri Augkaradacha, was convened the following morning at Kathu District Office to hear the drivers' complaints.

A compromise solution was agreed to by both sides that the first evaluation and review of the the new road system would be carried out after just 45 days, instead of 90 days as originally planned.

Madlee Sawangpol, a representative for the tuk-tuk drivers, said that the one-way system makes people drive too fast, increasing the likelihood of accidents and making it more difficult for drivers to pick up fares.

The need for traffic to drive on the right on many connecting roads is also wrong and many drivers have had difficulty getting used to it, he said.

Public hearings held before the introduction of the new system were attended by too few people representing only certain groups, he added.

Kathu Police Deputy Superintendent Pol Lt Col Chartchai Nicrodhanond, whose department worked together with

Patong Municipality in introducing the one-way system, said that K. Madlee attended a public hearing on the matter at Kathu Police Station on November 10 and had agreed to the proposed changes at the time.

Col Chartchai denied that the one-way situation has worsened traffic, except on the first day when drivers were still getting used to it.

The one-way system was now a law that all drivers must obey, he added.

Patong Mayor Pian Keesin and V/Gov Tri both said the tuktuk drivers were too quick to stage a protest, as the trial period was still only a week old.

A 56-year-old tuk-tuk driver who works the beach road told the *Gazette* that he didn't want to pass along his increased operating costs to tourists. "I don't want to raise fares [for a short journey] from 100 baht to 150 baht," he said.

The new system will have a trickle down effect on other businesses, he added.

"Tourists will no longer want to come into central Patong for dinner. Who wants to pay 400 baht in taxi fare to enjoy a 100-baht meal?" he asked.

"I used to get 300-500 baht during a daytime shift. Now on some days I have no fares at all," he said.

Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit told the *Gazette* that the protestors represented just a small group whose interests had been affected by the change.

"It's not as easy for tuk-tuk drivers and motorcycle taxi drivers now because they can't just stop or turn wherever they want under the new rules," he said.

Gov Niran sees the change as wonderful. "This is a great idea that was originally proposed years ago when Pongpayome Vasaputi was Governor," he said.

Hotels still refuse to pay rooms tax

PHUKET: Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) President Anchalee Vanich-Thepabutr has again threatened legal action against hotels that refuse to pay the controversial 1% rooms tax.

K. Anchalee said that the *OrBorJor* this year aims to collect 60 million baht in rooms tax, up from just more than 41 million baht collected during the fiscal year from October 1, 2005, to September 30, 2006.

However, she said that the tax collected during the past fiscal year was from 149 of the 522 hotels on Phuket.

K. Anchalee warned that the court has already passed a judgment requiring every hotel to pay the room tax. A reminder will be sent by mail to nonpaying hotels, she said.

Collection of the tax has proved difficult in the past. In fiscal 2004, some 47 million baht in revenue was collected from fewer than half of the 218 hotels in Phuket at the time.

The Gazette reported in January 2005 that many hoteliers, including members of the Thai Hotels Association, wanted more details about how the revenue would be spent before they would agree to paying the tax.

K. Anchalee explained that the 20-million-baht increase in rooms tax collected is expected to come from an increase in the number of tourists, in part from the Asia and Europe, but also from expanding Middle Eastern and Russian markets.

She added that the *OrBorJor* plans to ramp up tourism promotion in India, which she says offers the greatest untapped tourism potential for Phuket.



Kamala to get traditional Thai-Chinese medical center

KAMALA: Cabinet has approved a plan to build a traditional Thai-Chinese medical center with the assistance of the Chinese government at the site of the Kamala Public Health Office.

Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) Chief Dr Wanchai Sattayawuthipong said that the center will provide Thai and Chinese traditional treatments to both Thai and foreign patients.

The PPHO, which drew up the proposal, will now discuss the construction plan with experts from the traditional medicine section of China's Public Health Ministry.

The PPHO has budgeted 30 million baht for the project and expects additional funding from the Chinese government.

Construction is expected to begin by the end of this year, Dr Wanchai said.

Following Cabinet approval for the project, Thai Foreign Minister Nitya Pibulsonggram is now authorized to sign an Exchange of Notes drafted by the Chinese Embassy on Thailand's behalf.

Under the agreement, the Chinese government will co-ordinate a delegation to directly oversee construction.

Phuket runs out of "smart" ID cards

PHUKET: People seeking a new "smart" national ID card will have to wait until about mid-year to get their hands on one, as all District Offices on Phuket have run out of the new cards.

Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwannasuppana said that people will have to settle for an old-style card until the Department of Local Administration (DOLA) is able to get more smart cards from the national office of the Ministry of Information and Communications Technology (ICT).

Supattra Bhannaros, a registration officer at Phuket City Municipality, explained, "The ICT Ministry makes the smart cards and DOLA issues them. But now it seems that DOLA is having

problems getting the budget to buy more cards from the ICT Ministry."

K. Supattra explained that Phuket City Municipality received 1,000 smart cards directly from DOLA in Bangkok at the beginning of 2006, but has yet to receive more.

"Phuket City Municipality will issue the old-style card for people renewing their ID cards or applying for new ID cards. I can't say when Phuket City Municipality will start issuing smart cards again. We have to wait for DOLA," K. Supattra said.

An officer at the local DOLA office told the *Gazette* that more smart cards are expected to arrive about mid-year.

PPEA improves supply to prevent island blackouts

PHUKET: The island's residents are expected to suffer fewer electricity supply disruptions this year as power supply will be boosted to meet expected increases in demand, the head of the island's electricity provider has reported.

Suthep Jitseree of the Phuket Provincial Electricity Authority (PPEA) said the successful introduction of Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) technology to the island's power grid has reduced blackouts by isolating power disruptions before they can spread.

The SCADA technology, which uses automatic switches to isolate disruptions, was installed in 2005 at a cost of 386 million baht, he said.

was 1.138 billion kilowatt-hours (kWh), up about 5% from 2005. Usage is expected to increase another 6% by the end of 2007, K. Suthep said.

The number of users on the

Phuket power grid continues to rise, from 107,445 in 2005 to 113,800 in 2006, an increase of about 6%.

The figures include power usage on the Koh Yao islands, which, though in Phang Nga province, fall under the PPEA's service area, K. Suthep noted.

The grid's peak output was increased from 183 megawatts (MW) to 235MW during 2006, an

increase of more than 28%. The large increase mostly reflected ongoing repairs to the grid carried out after the tsunami. Peak output is expected to be increased by a further 10% by the end of 2007.

The PPEA currently operates four substations in Phuket – in Patong, at Srisoonthorn in Thalang, on Chao Fa West Rd, and on Thepkrasattri Rd in Phuket City. They have a combined output capacity of 413 megavolt amperes (MVA), K. Suthep said.

The PPEA is seeking to increase total output capacity by 100MVA by the end of 2009 and is looking for land in Karon and Thalang to site two new substations, he said.

In the longer term, the Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand (EGAT), which manages the PPEA, has announced a plan to build three 230KV substations on the island, with construction scheduled to begin in 2010. The first of these will be built in Koh Kaew, just north of Phuket City.

Teenager arrested for brutal murder

KATHU: Tung Tong Police have arrested a 17-year-old man for the brutal stabbing murder of 40year-old Nongying "Sao" Sengton in her home near Tung Tong Market in the early hours of November 27.

Pol Lt Col Witoon Kongsudjai, Deputy Superintendent of Tung Tong Police Station, said the arrest was made on January 16 at the youth's home in Phang Nga's Thapput District, where he had been in hiding since the mur-

The young man, who police named only as "Aek", was taken to Tung Tong Police Station the next day to re-enact the crime.

K. Sao's body was found by well-known property owner Thavorn "Pae Lian" Kajkla, who identified the victim as his "second wife", around 8 am on the day of the attack.

Her body had 15 deep stab wounds, the severity of which initially led police to believe she was murdered as a result of a personal conflict with her attacker.

However, Tung Tong Police Duty Inspector Pol Lt Col Passakorn Sonthikul told the Gazette that Aek said that he committed the murder solely for profit.

Aek was working as a builder in the area and lived with "Yod", a 24-year-old native of Nakhon Sri Thammarat Province, who was his accomplice, Col Passakorn explained.

Yod waited outside K. Sao's home and kept watch while Aek broke into the home to steal the victim's valuables, he

Police have fingerprint evidence linking Aek to the murder scene, Col Passakorn said.

"When we arrested him, he confessed that he killed K. Sao because she woke up while he was searching her home," he

Aek told police that he sold a gold bracelet and necklace stolen from K. Sao for about 60,000 baht at a gold shop in Thapput, sharing the money with Yod.

Yod is still at large.

Aek is being held at the Phuket Juvenile Observation and Protection Center.

TTVI chief transferred to inactive post

BANGKOK (Kom Chad Luek/ Gazette): Pol Col Khemmarin Hassiri, the Superintendent in charge of the Thailand Tsunami Victim Identification (TTVI) center, has been transferred to an inactive position at the Police Forensic Science Office.

His transfer is pending an investigation into allegations that money donated to the TTVI was used improperly.

The allegations were initially made by the foreign diplomatic missions of Finland, Germany, the Netherlands, Sweden, the UK, the US and France.

Ireland and Denmark have now added their names to the list of countries demanding an explanation from Thai police as to how funds donated by those countries were used.

Col Khemmarin told the Gazette that he was not worried by his transfer as it did not indicate that he himself was under suspicion.

He added, however, that the move would have an impact on TTVI's work at Bangmaruan Cemetery as the team would be leaderless.

Col Khemmarin told the Gazette that the results of the investigation into his team would be released to the public on February 9.

Pol Gen Ajiravid Subranbasaj, Deputy Commissioner-General of the Royal Thai Police, explained that Col Khemmarin's transfer was in line with standard practice to allow for transparency in an investigation.

He added that the American Embassy in Bangkok has hired international law firm Baker & McKenzie to audit the TTVI's finances from June 2005 to May 30, 2006, when the project's finances were under the control of an international committee.

On June 1, 2006, administration of the TTVI was handed over from the international committee to a panel comprising Royal Thai Police officers and one foreign auditor.

The TTVI's finances since June 1, 2006, will be investigated by the Office of the Auditor General of Thailand, Gen Ajiravid

Kamala hit with a spate of burglaries

KAMALA: Three hotel rooms in Kamala were burgled on three consecutive nights from January 17 to January 19.

On January 19, the room of Atitaya Shanon, 27, from Lop Buri, and her husband Simon Shanon, 37, from Ireland, was broken into while they slept at the

Pavilion Hotel.

K. Atitaya said that the thieves made off with 10,000 baht in cash, two mobile phones and a digital camera, worth a total of about 50,000 baht.

Burglaries were also reported at the Benjamin Resort on January 17 and the Twin Lotus Resort January 18. Kamala Police believe that all three burglaries are connected.

"I checked in to the hotel about 2 pm on the same day as the burglary. My husband saw two laborers near our room, so he asked to use the safe at the reception but they said they didn't have one," K. Atitaya said.

K. Atitaya explained that she and her husband returned to

their room around 10 pm, and slept through until the next morning.

They were woken up by hotel staff who said that they had found a bag that looked like one belonging to the couple at the bottom of the stairs leading to the room. When she checked, she realized she had been robbed, she said.

"I feel so bad that I was so unlucky," said K. Atitaya.

Pol Maj Monsak Srisuwan, Investigation Inspector at Kamala Police Station, said, "The burglars climbed in through the window while the victims were sleeping in their second-floor room.

"I believe the culprits were not locals as we haven't had a series of burglaries like this be-

"I have questioned the hotel staff, but did not find anything suspicious. We must patrol that area more effectively by checking more frequently," Maj Monsak added.

Cost of living in Phuket rises by 4.9%

PHUKET: The consumer price index in Phuket increased 4.9% in 2006, comprising sharp increases in several food categories, the Chief of the Phuket Commercial Affairs Office, Tada Pitchayaporn, has reported.

On January 15 K. Tada announced at the monthly "Governor meets the press" meeting that food and beverage prices increased 6% overall, led by sharp increases in fruits and vegetables (12.9%); basic ingredients (17%); and meat, poultry and seafood

The combined increases in all non-food-and-beverage categories was 4%, led by the rising costs of fuel and public trans-

K. Tada said the increases led to a decrease in consumer buying power, explaining that in 2006 consumers were paying 104.9 baht for the same quality and quantity of goods that would have cost 100 baht in 2005.

Although the Commercial Affairs Office cannot fix market prices, it monitors sales activity in fresh markets and large retail

centers to ensure that all products are sold according to correct retail practices, such as being correctly labeled.

Although the Phuket Commercial Affairs cannot set market prices, K. Tada encouraged the public to report overinflated prices to the Phuket Commercial Affairs Office at Tel: 076-212-

Clutching on to

apid development along Thailand's Andaman Coast has had a dramatic effect on the region's biodiversity – and not in a positive way. Among the most prominent victims are the area's sea turtles. Action is now being taken to reverse the decline, but some experts warn the effort is too little, too late.

The Third Naval Area Command, on Cape Panwa in Phuket, protects turtle nests on Koh Hoo Yong, also known as Island 1, one of the Similan Islands off Phang Nga.

The island, a national park where visitors are forbidden, is about 60 kilometers from Tab Lamu and takes about three hours to reach by speedboat.

Cdr Nimit Choowong explained that the Navy protects turtle eggs on Koh Hoo Yong from poaching and increases the survival rate of hatchlings by raising them until they are large enough to have a better chance of reaching maturity in the wild.

After hatching, many young turtles are picked off by monitor lizards and other predators before they can reach the sea.

Once in the water, the newly-hatched infants still have part of their egg casing attached, which causes them to float and makes them easy prey for sea birds, Cdr Nimit said.

It is estimated that if left to their own devices, only about 1% of the hatchlings survive to reproduction age.

"Three sailors stationed on the island are rotated every 15 days. Their duties include surveying the 800 meters of beach, feeding the turtles, changing their water and releasing fledgling turtles into the sea.

"Turtle eggs are incubated on the island until they hatch. When we rotate the sailors stationed on the island we take most of the young turtles to Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC). They are kept there until they are four to six months old, then released into the sea," he said.

"Since the tsunami, especially last year, the number of turtles nesting on Koh Hoo Yong has increased dramatically. We

still do not know the reason for this," Cdr Nimit said.

"When we find a turtle we name it and insert a microchip in its fin. We record where it was found, its size, where it laid its eggs and the number of eggs," he added.

"Eggs we collect are kept at our hatchery on Koh Hoo Yong. The eggs take 45 to 50 days to hatch. Last year we collected 9,047 eggs, of which 6,919 hatched; 1,261 turtles died while being raised and the rest were released at Koh Hoo Yong and other sites.

"To raise a turtle from hatching to six months old costs about 288 baht a turtle," he said.

Eggs being stolen for food is still a problem, though Cdr Nimit said that eggs on sale in Phuket are more likely to have been smuggled from Myanmar via Chiang Rai province, rather than collected locally. The eggs sell for 50 baht or more apiece, he added

The Navy project works very closely with the PMBC. Kongkiat Kittiwattawong, a ma-

rine biologist at the center, said that in the past 60 years the number of turtle nests in Thailand has fallen from more than 2,000 to the present total of 300 to 400.

"Many turtles are lost to fishing equipment, such as floating nets. This is an international problem, but the center can control only within Thailand. Other countries need to join the effort in order to protect turtles," K. Kongkiat said.

"The important turtle nesting areas in Thailand are Phang Nga, Phuket and Koh Khram in Chon Buri. After they hatch, the young turtles feed in seas around India, the Philippines, Malaysia, Indonesia and Vietnam," he said.

The PMBC has facilities to care for about 1,000 turtles at a time. The remainder are raised on Koh Hoo Yong.

"Female turtles return to [where they were born to] lay eggs every two to five years, depending on the availability of food", K. Kongkiat said. "One female turtle will lay about 400 eggs in a two- to four-month period.

"Our latest statistics show that 20 to 30 green turtles come to lay eggs on Koh Hoo Yong, 20 to 40 on the other Similan islands and 30 to 60 on Koh Khram," K. Kongkiat said.

"The eggs shouldn't be moved more than 24 hours after they were laid because by that time the nucleus will have connected with the food line, which is delicate and easily damaged.

"If you see a turtle nest, cover up the trail of the mother turtle leading from the sea so people will not be able to find the nest and do not disturb the eggs. The babies will hatch in around 55 days.

"Don't worry about people walking over the nest as the eggs are buried about 60cm underground," K. Kongkiat added.

Another group struggling to protect sea turtles in the region is the Ban Mai Khao Turtle Pres-

ervation Fund, which works with leatherback turtles (*Dermochelys* coriacea). The fund was established in 1990 by local villagers.

Manop Kidsang, President of the group in 2005, said, "Many turtles used to lay eggs on Mai Khao Beach, but we haven't had any for two years.

'The last one we saw was a leatherback turtle that came twice in 2004 before the tsunami. It's very strange because before in November and December we would have at least one turtle. I try not to think that maybe the tsunami has made the turtles forget their home.

"We have educated villagers about the importance of preserving our turtles, but I think it has come too late.

"Before, when turtles came here regularly, no one cared that their eggs were being stolen for food as turtle eggs are a delicacy

for local people. Now almost all villagers love the turtles and want to protect them.

"Now I wonder where our turtles have gone. All of the problems come from people. Maybe people in Mai Khao won't have the opportunity to see them anymore. This thought makes me feel very bad and full of regret," he

Songpol Tippayawong, Head of WWF Thailand's Marine and Coastal Resources Unit, said, "We are helping Tai Muang National Park [in Phang Nga] to conserve sea turtle nesting sites.

"Tai Muang has one of the last two leatherback turtle nesting sites in Thailand. Actually, it is probably the last one now because no turtle nestings have been reported at Mai Khao Beach for a couple of years.

"They have probably disappeared from that site as there is too much development in the area. Leatherbacks are very specific, they nest only on the mainland, and only the Tai Muang area is still suitable for them.

"The most serious threat to sea turtles is commercial trawlers and some kinds of fishing gear such as steel nets and lines with a number of hooks attached. There are no laws to prevent [these practices] and no one is really working to solve this prob-

"Controlling the number of trawlers that can be licensed per area per year would be very helpful, as would cracking down on harmful fishing gear

"Encroachment to their nesting sites is another problem Now there are very few places suitable for turtles to nest because tourism and urbanization is extending to Phang Nga and many other places that used to be pristine," he said.

"Zoning the coastal area more effectively or more appropriately would also help. For example, we have research showing that places with high light intensity from hotels, resorts or other development will have less turtles nesting compared to undisturbed areas – or even no nests at all," K. Songpol said.

Asked about the effectiveness of captive-raising turtles, K. Songpol replied, "We have few other options. I cannot say it is 100% good, but it is a way we can help. We have to help them.

"I don't think [raising the turtles away from the beach] will have an effect on their navigating system because this instinct is already rooted in their genes, their DNA.

"It has taken thousands of generations to develop this instinct so it cannot be changed in such a short time. I support the Navy project on Koh Hoo Yong and have arranged some workshops with them.

"In my opinion, we have no hope of conserving turtles here, they're going to be extinct in Thai waters very soon, especially the Olive Ridley (Lepidochelys olivacea) and leatherback.

"The only two that could survive are the green turtle and hawksbill turtle (Eretmochelys *imbricata*)," he said.

When the crowd warned him to be careful, he bragged that it was no problem, because he was an old and experienced ma-

To demonstrate that he had no fear of the elephant, he knocked hard on Plai Bodhingen's trunk.

The pachyderm, angered by K. Sai's knocking, shook his trunk hard, sending the drunken exmahout to the ground. But the elephant didn't stop there. He then wrapped his trunk around Sai's waist, picked him up like a rag doll and threw him against the

Hearing screams, Plai Bodhi-ngen's mahout, K. Pramote, rushed back to calm the enraged beast before calling the police to report the attack.

K. Sai was rushed to nearby Wangthong Hospital and eventually transferred to the better-equipped Buddhachinaraj Hospital in Phitsanuloke's Muang District.

K. Pramote said that Plai Bodhi-ngen had never before attacked a human, which was why he felt it was safe to leave him alone among a crowd of strang-

FISHING WITH WIND IN THEIR SAILS

nnovative thinkers are at it again in the Andaman region. After high fuel prices began taking a toll on the already suffering fishing industry, the Chaipattana Foundation, the Department of Fisheries and the Marine Fisheries Research and Development Bureau joined together to inject a gust of fresh air by adding sails to the enginedriven boats.

The fiberglass fishing boats were supplied by the Chaipattana Foundation, which was created by HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej to serve any urgent needs of the people.

After the 2004 tsunami the Chaipattana Foundation worked with the Thai Red Cross to donate 500 fiberglass boats to fisheries in six stricken regions.

Rangsan Chayakul, the Director-General of the Marine Fisheries Research and Development Bureau, said, "We aim to help local fishermen improve their lives by cutting their expenses.

"However, we still keep the engines on the boats to use when there is no wind".

K. Rangsan said that the fisheries taking part in the project don't use much equipment and have no more than four employees. They are currently testing the sails with fishing boats at Ao Makham.

"After the tests are complete, we will give sails to fishermen with fiberglass boats; many of them are interested in this.

"If it is successful in these six Andaman provinces, we have plans to expand to other provinces too," K. Rangsan said.

Praulai Nootmorn PHD, the Director of Andaman Sea Fisheries Research and Development Center, Department of Fisheries, told the *Gazette* that they tested three kinds of sail shapes: triangle, rectangle and trapezoid. The trials showed the trapezoid sail was best-suited to the fishing boats.


"From the test we found there have to be two people on the boat to control it, one on the tiller and the other to control the sail," K. Praulai said. "The program has received very good feedback from fishermen.

"On the day we tested the sails we saw many people watching us. They were probably wondering what were we doing. The local fisherman told me they paid 100 baht for fuel for three days,

so if they use sail part of the time they can save about 40 to 50% of their costs," K. Praulai said.

"We will start with four to five fishermen who are really interested in this, and then we need to get their feedback and spread the word to other fishermen," added K. Praulai.

Man, 87, beaten, strangled by son in family feud

olice in Thung Yai District, Nakhon Sri Thammarat, on January 17 arrested 60-year-old Sommai Janjaem for the murder of his 87year-old father, Ran. The alleged killer's 40-year-old younger sister, Ratree, was arrested for attempting to cover up the crime.

The investigating officer, Pol Lt Col Nitithon Thanseresagul, Deputy Superintendent of Thung Yai District Police Station, said that K. Ran's death was reported to them by Ratree at 3 am, January 6.

Ratree claimed that her father had been killed in a break-in about 5 pm the previous day. The 10 hours between K. Ran's death and the report to the police immediately raised suspicions, Col Nitithon said.

Police investigations revealed that Sommai, K. Ran's oldest son, had come to speak to his father at his house in Tambon Prik, Thung Yai, Col Nitithon continued.

Sommai was allegedly angry with his father for receiving a smaller share of the family's

olice in Thung Yai District, rubber plantation than he had Nakhon Sri Thammarat, hoped for.

When K. Ran refused to agree to his son's plans to install rubber processing equipment, an argument broke out and Sommai beat his father with a metal rubber-rolling pin and then strangled him with a length of rope, Col Nitithon said.

Col Nitithon explained that Ratree was present at the the time of the attack and out of fear and a wish to keep her brother out of prison, agreed to help conceal the crime.

The pair then scattered possessions around and planted evidence to make it seem as if a break-in had occurred, Col Nitithon said.

Sommai was charged with murder. Ratree was charged with obstructing justice. Both denied the charges.

Ratree was released on bail of 80,000 baht. Sommai, however, was refused bail on the grounds that he had a criminal record. He had previously served 18 months in prison for assaulting his parents

His assailant, who was allegedly laying in wait for him, fired just once before fleeing into the bushes.

Police are unsure of the motive for the attack as K. Yongyut was not known to have any enemies.

However, police are investigating a dispute between local villagers that he had recently brought to a resolution.

Ya bah couple caught: A man and his wife were arrested for selling *ya bah* (methamphetamine) in Ranong, January 13.

The couple, Manop Sukneam, 39, and his wife, Phakphean Chonsin, 29, were arrested by undercover police officers outside Wat Hadsompan as they were negotiating a deal with Sumet Chiwarorot, 25, who was also arrested.

Police found 361 pills of *ya bah* in the trouser pockets of the three suspects. All three were charged at Ranong Muang District Police Station.

Nasty nephew: A man was ar-

rested for leading an armed gang in robbing his aunt's house in Thung Yai District, Nakhon Sri Thammarat.

The victims, Sarot and Metta Majaroen, told police that at 1 am, January 18, five masked men forced their way into their house in Tambon Thung Yai. One of the men then pistol whipped K. Sarot until his face was covered in blood, while another held a knife to K. Metta's throat.

The gang made off with 20,000 baht in cash, jewelry made with about 180 grams of gold and 12 mobile phones, the victims told police.

K. Sarot's wounds required 12 stitches.

At 9:10 am the same day, Pol Sen Sgt Maj Taweesak Lekkla and Pol Sen Sgt Maj Suchat Praphreuk from Thung Song District Police Station, spotted a Toyota Tiger pickup matching the description of the vehicle used in the robbery parked in front of Thung Song train station.

When they approached the vehicle, the four men standing beside it all attempted to flee.

Police caught Somkiat Sangchuay, 30, and K. Metta's nephew, Phisit Reuthiphan, 26. Inside the truck they found five guns, a box of ammunition, two gold bracelets and three mobile phones.

At 11:30 am police arrested a third suspect, who they named only as Wutiwong, 24.

Isarn folk flock to change names

istrict Offices in the Northeast are facing a shortage of name-change forms after being overrun with people wishing to avoid bad luck in the Chinese Year of the Pig, which begins in February.

Astrologers have warned that individuals with names that start with the Thai letters "sor sua" or "por pla" would have bad luck in the Year of the Pig.

The Muang District Office in Nakhon Ratchasima ran out of name-change forms after being faced with 100-200 people a day applying to change their names over recent weeks. About 60% of applicants had names starting with the two unlucky letters. Similar scenes have occurred in Ubon Ratchathani and Khon Kaen.

Police are unconcerned because an individual's details and criminal record could still be checked via computer since the number on the national ID card remains the same after a name change, a spokesman said.

Reverse insemination? After the government approved in principle a proposal to amend the criminal code so that male rape victims would be able to sue their abusers, National Police Assistant Commissioner Jongrak Juthanont

said it would be difficult – but not impossible – to prove such charges.

Pol Col Pornchai Sutheerakhun of the Forensic Medicine Institute said physical examinations could find evidence in men who were forced to have anal sex if the victims immediately went to doctors.

Meanwhile, Women's Af-

fairs and Family Development Office Deputy Director Kingkeaw Insawang said the proposed legal amendment was intended to protect all rape victims, including boys, men and transsexuals.

The change focuses on a loophole in the current criminal code, which now defines a rapist as someone who rapes a woman who is not his wife.

In the proposed draft, rapists are defined as those who rape a person who is not their wife or husband.

R&D upgrade: The Science and Technology Ministry will introduce a bill proposing Thailand spend a minimum of 1% of gross domestic product (GDP) on science and technology in order to increase the country's international competitiveness.

Currently Thailand spends just 0.26% of its 7-trillion-baht GDP on science and technology development.

"The goal is expected to be achieved in the next few years. When the science minister met recently with the prime minister, the latter extended his full support for the proposed law," said Dr Teerachai Pornsinsirirak, Deputy Chief of the National Nanotechnology Center.

Thailand's spending on science and technology is among the lowest in Asia.

"More advanced countries such as Taiwan and Korea spend more than 1% of GDP on science and technology," Dr Teerachai said.

Fuzzy logic: Prime Minister Surayud Chulanont said an organizational revamp of the 200,000-

member Thai police force would be completed within the one-year term of the interim government.

Presiding over the opening ceremony of a seminar on the government's law enforcement policy, PM Surayud said one of the proposed solutions was the establishment of one national-level police policy committee, nine independent regional-level police policy committees and an independent committee to take public complaints of police misconduct.

More power decentralization to regions, the transfer of missions deemed not essential police duties to other agencies, and the improvement of 1,450 police stations and public security services were also proposed by the newly-established Police Development Commission.

Other proposals included improving the police investigation system, a change in the ranking system, and greater public participation in policing communities.

The revamp would reduce political interference in police work and increase public participation, the Prime Minister said.



he high season has been a good one so far, with high occupancy rates at hotels and waiting lines at restaurants.

But the first good season in years has highlighted an old problem we have already discussed, but have yet to solve: the lack of qualified staff.

Business owners are scratching their heads as staff jump from job to job for an extra 1,000 baht a month.

Sudden "sicknesses" during the peak season are common, and the complaints from staff have changed from the low season complaint of being bored to the high season complaint of being tired.

One resort owner told of a number of his staff threatening to quit on New Year's unless they receive raises.

With three large resorts, The Central, The Sheraton and The Sofitel, all competing for

staff, smaller boutique resorts and restaurants are suffering as their workers are plucked away.

Many businesses have resorted to employing part-time stu-

dents, which involves time-consuming training and monitoring.

Those who have best weathered the storm are familyrun businesses, as family members tend to be more reliable and trustworthy; or at least show up for work.

Polishing pearly whites: On January 6 and 7, Krabi Hospital was the location of a free dental clinic for children who lost parents in the 2004 Asian tsunami.

The clinic was spearheaded by Dr Vivian Broadway-Firmage, a dentist from California who survived the tsunami on Koh Phi Phi with her husband and two daughters.

Dr Broadway-Firmage raised money and materials in the US through dental supply companies who even provided her with the latest hand-held portable X-ray machine.

Over a two-day period, the children and their families were brought to the clinic by the Sriphong Phukaoluan Foundation, or www.krabirelief.com, whose Tsunami Child Sponsorship Program is supporting 101 children in Krabi.

The clinic was a major success and both the Mayor of Krabi, Keritisuk Phukaoluan, and the new Governor of Krabi, Siwa Sirisaowalak, were in attendance.

After their work was done, there were a lot of smiles show-casing cleaner teeth.

Helping is contagious: Projects-Abroad, a UK-based organization with a variety of programs worldwide, has been operating in Krabi Province since May 2005.

The project underway here is a marine conservation project run by Marten Meynell, who coordinates volunteers who pay their own way to work on the project.

Projects-Abroad, which started in 1992 by sponsoring teaching programs in Africa and Asia, is now operating in some 20 countries.

Their projects have expanded over the years to include community care, child support, medical aid and research, conservation and language classes.

Volunteers man these programs under the direction of Projects-Abroad professionals.

In Krabi, the project is focused on marine conservation and has several components.

The dive-based programs include reef monitoring, maintenance of artificial reefs, salvage diving and clean-up of waste materials.

Projects-Abroad operates in conjunction with the Ao Nang Scuba Center, allowing volunteers to get their PADI certification while helping with the clean up.

The second part of this program is the land-based clean-ups of the local beaches and outlying islands.

From Ao Nang to Koh Poda to Klong Muang, the group has been busy cleaning the beaches of debris.

The other major project being run by the team is mangrove replanting and maintenance. Using nurseries to grow young plants, they rehabilitate damaged areas.

Finally, when the group has spare time, they work with local authorities in mosquito control efforts as well as teach environmental awareness classes at local schools.



One to add to the wish-list

he Toyota Wish is the car Toyota does not want you to know about. Well, not quite, but despite representations direct to Toyota in Japan, the *Gazette* was unable to obtain photographs of the vehicle. The image you see on this page was captured in Rawai by your intrepid scribe.

The Wish is a popular domestic Japanese model, first introduced in January 2003, together with an expensive advertising campaign featuring Japanese singer Hikaru Utada.

It is imported into Thailand in CKD (completely knocked-down) form; in other words, it comes as a kit of parts with some local components added.

By assembling the vehicle here in Thailand, it means the Wish is considerably better value than comparable imported models

Thai assembly plants, located on the outskirts of Bangkok, are producing ever more vehicles. Outside the US, Thailand is now the world's largest producer of pick-up trucks, many of them for export to other Asian countries.

Toyota, which began operations in Thailand in 1956, has steadily increased its presence here until it reached its current status.

This year, Toyota is fore-casting a 6% rise in production volumes to a staggering 9.42 million vehicles and is likely to overtake General Motors as the world's No 1 automaker.

In Thailand it is already number one, with more than 80% of the SUV market, 38% of pickups and almost half the sedan market.

A little larger than the extremely popular Honda Jazz or the recently introduced Toyota Yaris, the recently face-lifted Wish offers reasonable space and comfort, together with a high degree of safety.

If there is a complaint it's that the Wish looks rather anonymous. It's one of those vehicles where you have to look at the badge to discover what it is. It does not say with any emphasis "Toyota" or indeed "Wish".

The Wish features a strong two-liter power plant sourced from the popular RAV4 along with various unusual features for a vehicle of this class, including traction control, a rarity at this level. Anti-lock braking is also standard.

Inside, sumptuous individu-



al captain's seats with a walkthrough feature comprise the second row seating, while an additional third row makes the Wish thoroughly practical for large families or groups of friends.

A host of trays and oddments bins are all handily placed, while there are standard cupholders for each seat. There is also a novel hook on the passenger door to accommodate a shopping bag.

There is a one-touch moon roof and a "smart" entry system using a proximity card within the ignition key.

Headlamps are high-intensity discharge lights proving good visibility in even the darkest corners of the island, while the rear lamps are of the energy-saving LED type.

The two-liter RAV4 engine produces a healthy 208 bhp (153 kW) at 6,000 rpm, with a maximum torque output of 192 Nm.

No speed or acceleration figures are revealed by Toyota, but reckon on around 200 km/h maximum velocity and a benchmark 0-100 km/h time of a little over 10 seconds.

Figures apart, the Wish feels responsive and reasonably nimble, despite its six/seven seat specification.


The mid-sized Toyota SUV has spawned a rash of competitors, notably the Mazda 5 (not yet available in Thailand) and the highly acclaimed Honda Stream.

Another contender is the newly introduced Toyota Avanza, although this is both smaller


and more expensive as it is imported fully assembled.


The Wish starts at 1.1 million baht and comes with a 36-

A market made for marriage

destitute corner of Europe hides a breathtaking pink and white surprise: thousands of wedding dresses.

Acres of frothing lace, dripping chiffon and figure-enhancing corsets, plus a mind-numbing selection of frocks and accessories, jam the Kalinovsky Market, a sometimes-muddy open-air bazaar on the outskirts of Chernivtsi, near Ukraine's border with Romania.

"We in Chernivtsi have always sewn wedding dresses; this was our tradition even during Soviet times," explained Vavara Kostiuk, owner and operator of one of the market's 300-plus specialist shops.

Roughly half of eastern Europe's languages echo off the Kalinovsky's pre-fab trading stalls on a busy day. You'll hear discussions on wedding dresses in Ukrainian, Russian, Hungarian, German, Polish, Georgian, Uzbek, Hebrew or Yiddish.

"That's one big reason there is a market specializing in wedding dresses out here," said Ihor Vybid, a registration lawyer working at the Kalinovsky. "This town is the old intersection between the Russian and Austro-Hungarian empires."

"There are no natural riches here, so what wealth we have, we have to make for ourselves," Kostiuk said.

An estimated 30,000 traders work at the Kalinovsky, making the market the largest employer and taxpayer in a district roughly the size of Luxembourg. The trading center operates its own cafes (better kept and attended than in the regional seat Chernivtsi), fire department, police force and medical clinic.

Irina Bortusiak is one of thousands of Chernivtsi women working at the Kalinovsky.

Bortusiak operates trading point 73, a four-meter square cubicle in a building containing 40 cubicles. She and a partner, both trained seamstresses, rent the stall. Their stock averages 20 dresses on hand, but they are willing to take an order for 100 times more, for the right customer.

"The whole Chernivtsi region supports the wedding dress trade," she said. "There are villages nearby where the women do nothing but sew – the men are unemployed or working abroad. So if we can't sew it, we farm it out."

A modest but attractive wedding dress, made in the village of Voloka, costs around US\$80. It arrives at the Kalinovsky partially finished, and when

trading point 73 completes it, the article sells for around US\$200, depending on the finish, Bortusiak said.

The most expensive fabric available at the Kalinovsky is In-

donesian raw silk at US\$65 a meter. Also commanding high prices are crinoline, moray and organza; usually from places like Turkey, Thailand and Vietnam.

A top-end dress with first-

rate materials and tailoring costs US\$300 to manufacture. It will sell in Kiev for twice that, and in Moscow or Paris for as much as five times the manufacturer's cost, workers at the market said.

Rhinestones, bugle beads and handmade bangles make their way to the Kalinovsky market by the ton from China and India. Glistening decorations sufficient to decorate one gown will set back a dress maker a cool US\$100 per dress, but with the right saleswoman the glitter can triple the retail value of a dress.

This summer at the Kalinovsky there was a big run of enameled steel eyelets and thick white lacing, as laced corsets not quite closing fully were in fashion, to enhance a bride's nicely-tanned back.

Tailors' mannequins cost between US\$25 and US\$125 each, depending on its origin. The cheapest are Turkish, the most expensive are Polish.

Ukraine makes its own mannequins as well, available at a mid-range US\$70 each.

The Ukrainian mannequins are superior to the foreign competition, more than one saleswoman claimed. Why?

"A typical marriage-age Ukrainian girl has a more substantial bust and a more svelte hips and waist than foreign girls," explained mannequin trader Edvina Grigorievna, with more than a trace of pride.

"So naturally our Ukrainian mannequins model the shape of our girls better."

A huge problem in the business, Kostiuk and Bortusiak agreed, is creating a dress that is simultaneously fashionable yet unique.

"We sell to anyone – retail, wholesale, everyone is a customer for us," she said. "But frankly, I prefer wholesale. With this market right at their door, Chernivtsi brides are the most spoiled in the world!"

Wilson, Mizuno, and Nike are the favored women's brands at Sport World.


K. Phairoj said that golfers' favorite brands are Nike and Adidas because golfers like to wear or use golf equipment that famous athletes and fellow golfers are using.

"In our research of golfers in Phuket, most are middle- to upper-class local people and tourists from Europe and Asia.


"They come here because there are complete golf courses such as Mission Hill, Blue Canyon or Phuket Country Club. We have also found that some tourists take charter flights just to play


As they make such long trips to play their game, K. Rataya said, they also want to look their best with matching colors for the golf equipment, shoes, socks, pants and shirts.

or anyone who equates Japan with high-tech, high-rise, highfalutin sophistication, Tohoku comes as a surprise.


The region – on the island of Honshu and far north of the ever-burgeoning metropoli of Tokyo and Osaka – is Nippon's backcountry, with vast lakes, forests, rolling countryside, superb ski runs and farmland, plus the occasional quirk to add spice to the mix.

Perhaps one of the most bucolic locations in all of Tohoku is the Geibikei Gorge, in Iwate Prefecture.

The water running between the gorge's towering, tree-hung cliffs is no more than a couple of feet deep, and the ideal way to take in the sights is to board a flatbottomed punt and be poled slowly upstream by one of the ancient boatmen for whom this is not so much a living as a vocation.

There is practically no noise here, except when the boatmen launch into folk songs – plaintive, melodious, wistful and as far from the artifice of karaoke as could be imagined. There's no doubt about it, this is the Japan of yesteryear.

For Japanese one of the main attractions of Tohoku is its plethora of *onsen*, or hot springs. The volcanic shifts beneath the earth's crust, which make life in other parts of the country so perilous, send superheated water bubbling up in myriad locations around the region.





One of the most picturesque of the spas is the Aoni Onsen, tucked into a wooded valley in Aomori Prefecture and lit only by oil lamps.

Rustic is the watchword

ety huts covering the steaming pools of water, and bathers delicately picking their way along the stony paths with only a minuscule towel between themselves and

here, in one of the few onsen where mixed bathing is a matter of course.

Bathers shower first, then head for the spa where they slide into the water before removing the towel. In winter, when temperatures plummet, the towel is dipped in the water from time to time and then placed on top of the head.

After broiling yourself for as long as you can stand it, it's a short step back indoors, and then time for a cup of tea and an hour or so relaxing with your skin tingling from tip to toe.

Tohoku's cuisine mirrors that in other parts of the country – beautifully presented, the acme of freshness and with a taste to


However, the town of Morioka has got fast food down to a fine art. Restaurant patrons here sit cross-legged on the floor and are encouraged to compete in gulping down as many – admittedly small – bowls of buckwheat noodles, known as Wanko Soba, as they can manage.

Waitresses stand by with loaded trays handing out refills the moment customers signal they are ready, and the bowls are stacked up on the table as proof of the diners' appetites.

It's reminiscent of one of Japan's wackier television game shows, with those who have eaten their fill egging on their friends to put down just one more bowl in an atmosphere that borders on sheer hilarity.

No records have been kept, but it's not unusual to see the stouter, sumo-ish sort of diner looking replete and proud with around 100 inverted bowls stacked in front of him.





Noodles by the boatload

hen you're looking for a cheap, tasty, fast meal, it's hard to beat a bowl of noodles, especially boat noodles.

The dish, called *kuay teaw rua*, derives its name from the times when Thai people who lived by a canal would order the noodles from vendors who paddled by.

The vendors have changed, but the noodles are still often served in symbolic and recognizable boat-shaped bowls.

On Chao Fa East Rd, near Wat Thepnimit, is *Kuay Teaw Rua Samuprai Ko Aod* ("Ko Aod's Herbal Boat Noodles"), where Wasan "Ko Aod" Sitthirat serves his signature boat noodles, with his unique blend of Thai herbs in the soup seasoning, all day long.

Ko Aod opened his restaurant April last year, after his previous venture – a beer garden – failed. His new restaurant is a return to serving boat noodles. Before running the beer garden, Ko Aod sold his herbal boat noodles at Koh Sireh for about three years, when he invented his secret recipe.

The menu includes *sen mee* (small, white, vermicelli-like noodles), *sen lek* (small white noodles), *bamee* (yellow noodles)

and *sen yai* (large flat noodles). All can be ordered with pork or beef meatballs, and can be eaten either as dry noodles or in a soup. Prices range from 10 to 30 baht per bowl.

One dish that stands out on the menu is the pork blood soup, called *nam tok*, which is created by adding fresh pork blood to the hot soup to give the noodles a stronger flavor. This is also served with dried pork skin (*cap moo*), fresh sprouts and sweet basil leaves

The shop also serves fresh *longan* and coconut juice at 10 baht a glass.

Don't be surprised if you drop by and see Ko Aod smiling. He said that he gets rave reviews from customers, much better than when he ran the beer garden.

"We serve delicious noodles flavored with herbs, which is healthy. And people can be full at a cheap price," he said.

The shop is open daily from 10 am to 6 pm, and can seat about 50 customers.







Another miss from Martin Amis

liam Boyd and Ian McEwan as the top triumvirate of their British literary generation. But while Boyd and McEwan have gone from strength to strength, Amis has slipped badly.

His eighth novel, Yellow Dog, was universally panned. I recall one reviewer observing that reading Yellow Dog was

like catching your favorite uncle in an obscene public sex

Amis had been famous for big rollicking comic novels such as Success and Money, characterized by long, sinuous, bravura passages of rococo hilarity.

His latest, House of Meetings (Jonathan Cape, London, 2006, 198pp), is short and terse.

Instead of his usual stamping ground – the trendy world of London and New York – his subject is the gulag of Stalinist Russia.

Why is the privileged son of novelist Kingsley Amis, born four years before the death of Stalin, treading on the turf of Alexander Solzhenitsyn's Gulag Archipelago?

Well, because he can. Like Solzhenitsyn's One Day in the Life of Ivan *Denisovich*, this is a short book and rings with authenticity. The labor camp of Norlag is inside the Arctic Circle and death from

have long regarded Martin Amis, Wil-hunger and exposure are an everyday occurrence:

> "Even in June your breath hung in the air as if you were smoking an enormous and fiery cigar. They went out six feet and curled back around you, these scarves of breath."

> The unnamed narrator was born in 1919, served on the front line in the Great


> > Patriotic War, raped his way across Germany and shortly after the war was imprisoned, ironically, as a "fascist". In 1948, his half-brother Lev winds up in the same camp for the same reason. They are both in love with Zoya, a beautiful Jewish university student who has rejected the narrator and married Lev.

> > It is now 2004 and the ex-slave laborer is on a tourist steamer, the Georgi Zhukov,

on a 2,500-kilometer voyage up the Yenisei River, which flows into the Arctic Ocean. He is on his way to visit the site of his old camp, a rich American now, "a vile-tempered and foul-mouthed old man".

Day by day he writes the account of his life to Venus, his American stepdaughter, a recent college graduate who in the fashion of the day has been urging him to "vent" and "achieve closure". As he writes he feels himself "re-Russifying all over

"So keep a look-out, hereafter, for



other national traits: the freedom from all responsibility and scruple, the energetic championship of views and beliefs that are not only irreconcilable but also mutually exclusive, the weakness for a humor of squalor and cynicism, the tendency to speak most passionately when being most insincere, and the thirst for abstract argument (abstract to the point of pretension) at unlikely moments – say in the middle of a prison stampede, at the climax of a cholera riot, or in the most sepulchral phase of a terror-famine."

Eventually he will lead a murderous pogrom against informers in the camp and stand in the forefront of the Norlag strike of 1953 in which the political inmates faced down the post-Stalin state.

Unlike Solzhenitsyn, he hates Russia and he hates God. Once released from camp, he thrives in a gangster economy and now, "I am back in the bosom of a vast slum family. Now it has to fend for itself. All the money has been divided up between the felons and the state."

This is a strong narrative voice and its bitterness and eloquence carry the reader along. The problem is the other two parts of the romantic triangle: Lev and Zoya.

Zoya never comes across as anything but a sex goddess without much to say. Lev is simply impossible, a pacifist for no discernible reason, a romantic idealist who is destroyed by a single connubial visit by Zoya to the camp's House of Meetings, where he loses his "sense of play".

What this means I can't figure out, but his malaise extends to civilian life, where he resolutely becomes a failure. Zoya suffers an even worse fate.

The narrator's sole consolation is that modern Russia's death rate is surpassing its birth rate: "Russia is dying. And I'm glad."



When goodwill turns turtle

When a leatherback turtle laid a clutch of 103 eggs on Karon Beach last month it made headline news across Thailand. The leatherback, quickly dubbed "Santarina" for its unexpected arrival on Christmas Day, was the first sea turtle sighted at the beach in decade. Could the leatherback really be staging a comeback in Phuket? Sadly, the answer appears to be "no".

Despite the unexpected visit, the future for sea turtles in Thai waters remains grim [see Inside Story, pages 4 and 5].

Even sea turtle conservation experts concede that the days are numbered for the sea turtles along Thailand's Andaman Coast. Poorlyregulated coastal development in the region has taken its toll, both on sea turtle nesting sites and on the marine habitats that have sustained these fascinating creatures since the time of the dinosaurs.

In the open ocean, where the migratory sea turtles spend most of their lives, they are also under almost constant threat from mankind. They can choke on wide range of synthetic materials found floating as trash.

Every year, scores of sea turtles die needlessly as "by-catch" of the tuna fishing industry, which uses long monofilament lines ("longlines") of individually-baited hooks that stretch for tens of kilometers. Some turtles are caught when they nibble the bait, while others become entangled and drown. The exact toll on sea turtle populations from by-catch can never be known, as sea turtle carcasses are seldom, if ever, returned to port.

Attempts to minimize by-catch, such as by using simple-buteffective "turtle excluder devices" that allow most sea turtles to escape trawlers' nets, are given scant attention by the fishing industries of most countries in the region.

Thailand is one of 24 signatory states to the Indian Ocean-Southeast Asian (IOSEA) Marine Turtle Memorandum Of Understanding and also plays host to that multinational organization's secretariat offices located in Bangkok.

IOSEA, established in 2001, correctly recognizes the need for a regional approach to conservation of the six sea turtle species, all of which are migratory.

Unfortunately, IOSEA's work has done little to save the sea turtle from what appears to be an inevitable date with extinction.

Despite years of high-profile events held in Phuket to raise public awareness about the plight of the sea turtle, the eggs of the Santarina turtle were quickly poached by villagers in Karon who hoped to sell them at a profit. Luckily, officers recovered the eggs, but the damage they suffered may never be known.

What could be more disheartening for an island that wants to tout itself as a sustainable tourism destination. - The Editor

Tuk-tuk fares are out of control

I picked up a copy of the January 2007 edition of a local tourist guide and was amazed by the prices quoted:

"Day time fare for a tuk-tuk within a beach resort 20 baht. Evening fare for a tuk-tuk within a beach resort 40 baht." Please tell me where this place is, so that I can book for there next year!

I am a first-time visitor to Patong and I have been horrified at the prices charged by the tuktuks for a short distance.

We are staying on Soi

Sevatasai, near the fresh market on Nanai Rd. From Jungceylon, it was 100 baht fare until Saturday, and has now mysteriously become 150 baht. Another visitor told us that he pays 200 baht for the same journey.

There is no list of acceptable fares on view anywhere. Having one would be good; it would stop customers from feeling they are being cheated.

A price list should be displayed in every tuk-tuk and taxi.

Perhaps the Gazette could publish a realistic price list of fares for tuk-tuks in the Patong area, as the prices are becoming out of control.

It would be a great help to know just how much a fare to Kamala or Karon beach should

It may also be an idea to install meters in the tuk-tuks, so that they have to charge a reasonable rate.

Those of us who do not wish to drive are being held hostage to the tuk-tuks and their excessive fares

If there were a local bus service, Patong's dreadful traffic problem would improve overnight as it would be easy to hop on and off a local bus.

Phuket has the poorest bus service of any of the places we have traveled in Thailand. The only local bus goes from Patong to Phuket City.

It is not acceptable to have to go all the way there and then have to take another bus all the way back to Karon or Kamala.

We feel we are constantly being ripped off by taxi and tuktuk drivers. It is such a pity when so many other things here are so good.

have been a government officer since 1975. I have served as Nai Amphur [District Chief] in many areas, including Tak Bai District in Narathiwat, Satingphra and Chana in Songkhla, and Kuan Tanode and Langoo in Satun.

I was also Nai Amphur of Nakhon Sri Thammarat's Muang District for one year before my transfer to Phuket on December

The position of *Palad* is under the Ministry of the Interior's Department of Local Administration (DOLA). The main responsibility of this office is to ease the suffering of people and keep them happy.

This involves a variety of tasks, such as ensuring that government services are convenient, providing fairness to the public, overseeing census registration and controlling business at establishments like entertainment venues, shops and hotels.

I know that in moving to Phuket I have to accept that there is trouble everywhere. My experience after just a few weeks working in Phuket is that the problems here are not that different from other places, but that because we have so many people, there are more of them.

Most of the problems here concern land encroachment, gun control, gambling, poverty, drugs and the number of traffic acci-

Although Phuket has more

Phuket Provincial has a new Chief Administrative Officer, or Palad. Piya Bharatasilpin, 55, takes up his post as the Governor's righthand man well aware of the many problems that led his predecessor to request a transfer: land encroachment disputes, court cases and security issues, to name just a

problems than other places, that is no barrier to my work.

In fact, I had been to Phuket two or three times before I was posted here. I really love seaside provinces because I like to fish in my free time.

Formerly I worked in Satun province and on Koh Samui, both by the sea. So it's not hard for me to live in Phuket.

My main duty is to work together with Nai Amphur, Kamnan (tambon chiefs) and Phu Yai Baan (village headmen). Usually I just need to oversee their work and let them solve problems, but in special circumstances or emergency situations I can come down and deal with matters di-

I will hold monthly meetings with all three Nai Amphur to exchange opinions and ideas and learn about the problems they and their constituents face.

I also take orders from the Phuket Governor. The first duty that Governor Niran Kalayanamit assigned me with is to implement a Royal Project to better extend government services to rural

This includes establishing a a "mobile unit" to enable people living far from their nearest district office to register for "smart cards" and update house registration forms without having to

Now we require a budget of about three million baht more to set up a satellite communication system in the "mobile unit"

The system will link the van with the government database. This will not only help save the public time and money, but it will also help Phuket get a more accurate census tally and ease Phuket's "hidden population" problem.

If we get a correct population count for Phuket, it will improve funding in many areas, such as education, roads, health care and basic infrastructure develop-

My work also includes working for the Damrongtham Center [provincial ombudsman's office], which comprises a team made up of police, government officers and representatives of other government agencies who work together to investigate letters of complaint that we receive.

This way of dealing with problems offers faster solutions than the normal procedure working through the district office.

We have so many complaints about different issues, including sale and use of illegal narcotics, environmental problems, wastewater, gambling...the list

We have to look at how pressing each problem is and figure out which department should be assigned to investigate or solve the matter. If it is an emergency, I might go down and solve the problem myself.

Increasing social harmony here in Phuket is my first goal. If people are living in peace, crime and poverty will decrease and Phuket will become better and more livable.

To do his best, a government official needs to really get involved and address many problems, not just a few. If all of our government officers are dedicated and sincere, I think we can combine our many different skills the help quickly solve the problems that confront us.

We will be relocating from Thailand to Kathmandu, Nepal, and we have a pet dog that we would like to take with us. We will be flying out of Phuket on a Thai Airways flight with a connecting flight in Bangkok. What are the procedures for taking our dog with us?

To import a pet to Nepal, all that is required is for the pet's owner to show a certificate issued by a veterinarian in Thailand confirming that the animal is free of diseases. The owner must show this certificate when the pet arrives at the Animal Quarantine Office at the airport in Kath-

Angkhana Damrongchua, of the Thai Airways International **Reservation Desk, replies:**

Thai Airways also requires a certificate of clean health, and the Phuket Animal Quarantine Station at Phuket International Airport must issue this certificate. Once this is done, you must call us at the Thai Airways reservation desk and inform us of the certificate number at least three days before your flight.

When you check in, if your dog's weight plus the cage (which must be provided) is less than 10 kilograms, then the dog can be loaded into the cabin.

But if your dog plus the cage is heavier than 10kg or if the cage is bigger than 55cm x 37cm x 30cm, then the dog must be loaded in the hold, and we will charge you for the excess weight.

Alternatively, you can have your dog flown by a cargo company, which will still require the certificate issued by the quarantine station.

Cargo companies that deliver pets include Pasco (Tel: 076-238824-6), Sky Trade (Tel: 076-351329) T&M (Tel: 076-351474), and Thai Airways Cargo (Tel: 076-351306).

To be issued the certificate, you must bring your dog to the Phuket Animal Quarantine Station with the following documents:

- 1. Dog's medical history book that shows all vaccinations the animal has had since it was born.
- 2. Blood test result or health certificate from a veterinarian who works at pet clinic or pet hos-
- 3. Proof of a rabies vaccination at least 30 days before its de-
- 4. The owner's passport (the pas-

senger who will be transporting the dog).

- 5. A "dog passport", available at the Phuket Livestock Office. To get this you must present the Livestock Office with the health certificate and a photo of the dog.
- 6. Microchip and microchip number (you can request this from vour vet).
- 7. Any pedigree certification for your dog.

The Animal Quarantine Station will check all documents and your dog's health and issue the

certificate for you to show to the airline. You must finish all this at least three days before departure.

Pitipat Kitpitatkun, a veterinarian at Rak Satt Pet Hospital in Phuket City, replies:

We need to check the resistance of rabies in the dog's blood. This is very important, especially if the dog will go to European countries or Japan. The rabies vaccine must be administered at least 30 days before de-

If you want to take your dog to another country, you must bring its vaccination record to the vet clinic; there the vet can double check the dog's health and issue a certificate of clean health.

The veterinarian's office can also put a microchip in the dog if it doesn't have one yet.

The Gazette notes:

It is advised to consult your preferred vet about what size transportation crate is appropriate for your dog and whether your dog should be tranquilized before being loaded onto the plane.

sometimes hold political demonstrations, the gov ernment is planning to establish a Ministry of Polite Protests.




Tsow: I notice that none of the signs you have proposed have exclamation marks.

K. Soft: Absolutely. Those will create confusion, because nowadays lots of people identify Satan with America. We don't want people to think our PM is an American.

Tsow: What about Rahu, the god of darkness? The symbolism could be compelling.


Just as Rahu eats the moon, you could accuse powerful figures of eating Thai democracy. Cartoons could portray them as Rahu munching on the Democracy Monument.

I recently installed Skype (www.skype.com), which lets me talk for free with other people using Skype on their computers, but when I use Skype to talk with family members in Holland and Switzerland, their voices keep fading out.

I have a 512-Kbps ADSL Internet connection, provided by Jasmine Internet and running on Windows XP, at my home in Baan Sakoo, Thalang. Can you explain what is happening? Is there something I can do about

Thalang

If your family members also have ADSL lines, and you can make the connection, then the most likely culprit is your Internet connection speed here in Phu-

In Phuket, most ADSL services – whether they're rated at 512Kbps (thousands of bits per second), 1Mbps (1,000Kbps) or even 2Mbps – frequently run at 30 to 40Kbps.

The telephone companies are notorious for putting too many customers on a single connection and when demand gets heavy –

especially in the afternoon, eveKHUN WOODY'S nings and on weekends - the data pipes aren't big enough to handle the load.

The easiest solution is to use no idea why. Skype in the mornings here, even though it's late at night in Europe. Failing that, you'll have to find a faster Internet service.

If you do decide to upgrade your connection, my recommendation is CAT's EV-DO wireless service, and CAT has recently made the service more affordable. I didn't believe it either, but if you drop by your friendly local CAT office on Phang Nga Rd in Phuket City, or in Patong's Aroonsom Plaza near Andaman Beach Suites, you can see for yourself.

Skype, routers and XP vs Vista

CAT will sell you the Sierra Wireless AirCard 580 for 15,990 baht. That's expensive but you get free, unlimited service until the end of April, 2007.

Starting May 1, you pay 590 baht a month. That's about half what CAT used to charge - and it compares very favorably with similar 3G service anywhere else in the world.

As far as I've seen, CAT's EV-DO service still runs rings around every ADSL package on the island, except for CAT's direct lines (which run faster, but cost 2,600 baht per month). I've heard from many readers who achieve "real" 400 to 800kbps download speeds in most parts of Phuket, and other places in Thailand. One reader says he even got a signal at the Andaman Club

> in Burma, off Ranong. Many readers found there was little slowdown after the earthquake in Taiwan. I have

COMPUTER

Considering my TOTADSL line currently runs about 30kbps on a good day with a stiff tailwind, EV-DO makes a whole lotta sense and should solve your Skype troubles.

My company has six relatively new PCs, all put together by a well-known local computer company.

I was shocked to discover that the copies of Windows XP on those computers are "not genuine" (to use Microsoft's euphemistic terminology). In short, I'm

now in a position where I need to buy six copies of Windows.

Should I buy Windows XP or Windows Vista?

Phuket

Yours is a common problem.I'd guess that there are at least 10 times as many companies in Thailand running pirate copies of Windows as run completely legit ones. That doesn't make running bootlegs legal or right. It makes it common.

With Microsoft turning the screws on Windows validation, more and more companies are going to find it safer – and easier - to tear down the pirate flags and belly up to the Microsoft bar.

If your computers are relatively new, have 1 GB of memory or more and have fast video cards with 128MB of video memory or more, you should consider buying Vista.

On the other hand, if your computer inventory looks like a mixed bag of wheezers, you should stick with Windows XP for the older machines, and selectively install Vista on the ones that can handle the load.

Upgrading from Windows XP to Vista is a real pain in the neck. I strongly recommend that upgraders take a "scorched earth" approach, completely wipe out their hard drives and install Vista from scratch.

Changing from pirate Windows XP to a legitimate copy, on the other hand, is quite straightforward. Microsoft has released a program that lets you type in your valid activation key, and make your pirate copy "legit" without re-installing. See bink.nu/ Article8072.bink for details.

Here's the rub. In the past you've been able to buy an "upgrade" version of Windows and install it on any computer that's running an older version of Windows, and the "upgrades" cost much less than the "full" packages of Windows.

It was an open secret – and an open joke – that feeding the "upgrade" version of Windows almost any older version of Windows would clear the upgrade hurdle. For example, if you bought a Windows XP "upgrade" package, you could fake out the installer by using a pirate copy of Windows 98 as your "old" copy of Windows.

That doesn't work with Vista. You can install a Vista "upgrade" copy only on a machine that's running a fully legitimate copy of Windows XP. If you have a bevy of machines running pirate versions of Windows XP, you have to spring for "full" packages of Vista. OEM copies of Vista should work as "full" packages.

Historically, Thailand has been a horrible place to buy Windows: I've seen retail boxes of Windows XP with prices marked on them that are twice the going rate in the US and Europe. Shop around before shelling out the money for legit copies of Windows XP or Vista, and don't be afraid to buy packages overseas. A legitimate Singapore version of Vista is every bit as valid in Thailand as it is in Singapore.

One final note: if you're buying five or more copies of either Windows XP or Vista, look into Microsoft's Volume Licensing Plan. Hard to believe, but there are discounts available for as few as five "seats" of both Windows and Office. You can contact Microsoft's headquarters in Thailand at Tel: 02-2574999.





conomics is probably the most underestimated and misunderstood influence in our lives. It dictates the movement of interest rates that have a fundamental impact on how economies operate, currencies move and asset prices react – all of which directly affect people's lives.

There is a strong tendency among economists to believe that they can predict the future, and sometimes they can, but often their predictions are wrong.

A good example is the US economy. The economists of many top financial institutions confidently predicted in the final weeks of 2006 that the US Federal Reserve would shortly start to reduce interest rates.

This was based on their short-term outlook for the US economy, which they expected to slow rapidly. In reality, the economy did the opposite.

In December 2006 it created about 35% more jobs than analysts had predicted, and retail sales strongly outperformed analysts' expectations. This had a

number of immediate effects that have been felt around the world.

Over the past few weeks analysts have expected the US dollar to fall against other major currencies. Instead, the dollar has moved in the completely opposite direction.

Stock markets in Asia that ex-

perienced losses in the first few days of 2007 started to appreciate that if US economic growth was increasing, then overall demand supported higher prices. Thus, those stock markets started to recover from their earlier falls. There were exceptions – Thailand was one, but that was due to local factors overriding a general trend.

US economy not alone in defying predictions

The US economy is not in the middle of a boom – the stilltroubling residential housing market is affecting the construction industry and many other directlyrelated sectors. Manufacturing in general is also relatively weak. However, these areas are being countered by a stronger than anticipated service sector, which is still exceeding expectations.

This has led to a new view that sees the likelihood of interest rate cuts being pushed into the second half of 2007 or even disappearing completely. Falling energy prices are also lowering inflationary pressures.

If this trend continues, the US Federal Reserve may cut in-

terest rates, but as this is only one component, it will have limited effect.

Stock markets were initially disappointed by the prospect of US interest rates being unlikely to fall in the short term.

This may appear strange in the context of better By Richard Watson economic numbers, but falling interest

> rates are a valuable short-term stimulus to stock markets because they cut the cost of corporate borrowing. The stock markets later rallied on better economic news, feeling that corporate profits were likely to benefit.

Across the pond, the decision by the Bank of England (BoE), the UK's Central Bank, to raise interest rates by 0.25%

to a base level of 5.25% took the market and virtually every analyst by surprise.

This decision was made because inflation had risen to 2.7%, above the BoE's target. It also had the immediate effect of raising the value of sterling in foreign exchange markets.

This shows the benefits to Britain of having an independent currency.

Many people wonder why Britain is not a member of the Euro zone. There are advantages in joining a larger currency, such trade and commercial contracts being removed from exchange rate risk.

On the other hand, among the problems posed by economic integration would be the loss of the UK's ability to individually manage its economy.

The expected initial result of currency integration would be a huge economic boom and rise in asset prices.

Property prices would rocket, as borrowing costs would fall by 2%, the difference between interest rates in the Euro zone and those in the UK.

The British would also go on an unprecedented spending spree and credit card debt would soar from what are already record levels. Inflation rates would swiftly become uncontrollable but the European Central Bank could not be expected to raise interest rates just to suit the UK.

Around 92% of British mortgages have adjustable rates, while in continental Europe almost all mortgages have fixed interest rates.

It is unlikely UK mortgage borrowers would take advantage of the sharp interest rate reduction to refinance their mortgages to a fixed basis.

new economics term has Abeen introduced to the world recently: "Chindia" and this name, unless it is quickly superseded, is likely to become a fixture for years to come.

Chindia is simply the name given to the huge potential global economic influence of China and India combined.

Both countries are reflecting growth now in excess of 9% and India seems to be accelerating to double digits.

The combined effect of these two economies, barring any unforeseen event, on the global economy is going to be of ever increasing importance and the pace of their growth is going to change the world.

PHUKET: Following the release of Phuket Provincial Land Office (PPLO) statistics on Phuket property development values and land ownership transfers, PPLO Chief Registrar Somboon Santiamorntat says that confidence remains in Phuket's property market despite events since September last year.

"The PPLO uses the 'total investment' values of property projects and the amount of tax collected on property ownership transfers as indicators to track Phuket property market's performance," K. Somboon explained.

Developers must register their projects with the PPLO, he said, and must give a total value of the development once complet-

The PPLO collects its statistics according to the Thai fiscal year, from October 1 each year through to September 30 the following year.

"The total investment value [of Phuket property projects] in fiscal year 2004 was 9.18 billion baht, while in fiscal 2005 the figure fell to 7.94 billion baht because of the tsunami," K. Somboon said.

"But in 2006 (October 2005 to September 2006), the total investment value increased to 10.03 billion baht – a 21% increase, which shows that the Phuket property is performing well," he

Confidence in property still strong, says Land Office

In fiscal 2004, there were 51 projects registered with the PPLO, and 42 projects in fiscal 2005. In fiscal 2006, that dropped to 41 property developments reg-

Another healthy indicator, K. Somboon said, was the tax collected on ownership transfers. "In fiscal 2006 the PPLO collected 1.47 billion baht in land taxes and service fees, up from about 1.09 billion baht in 2005," he said.

However, K. Somboon added, "From October through December 2006, the PPLO collected 314 million baht in land taxes and fees, down from 365.5 million baht the same period the previous year."

K. Somboon attributed the slowdown to the impact of the new nominee legislation. "Since the Interior Minister introduced the Nominee Act [in May 2006], the number of property transactions has slowed down.

"The Act means that we must carefully check companies with foreign shareholders, so some companies are not buying property at the moment. They are just waiting to see if there are any


further changes to government policy," K. Somboon said.

"Some foreign firms have slowed down their volume of transactions, preferring to just lay down deposits and postpone the transfers for now," he added.

"Anyway, it's not a huge number of firms that are doing this so it won't have a big effect on the property market," he

Despite the current slowdown, K. Somboon said he was confident Phuket's property market will recover. "Phuket land prices continue to increase because there is a limited amount of land on the island, while demand for it is increasing.

"Land prices in Patong continue to increase, and in Phuket City, some plots near Tesco-Lotus, Big C and Central Festival have increased in price by as much as 200% from last year," K. Somboon said.

Lord of the Flyweights

'n a residential neighborhood in Bangkok is WBC flyweight titleholder Pongsaklek Wonjongkam's home away from home, the Petchvindee Gym. Pongsaklek, 29, doesn't look like a veteran of more than 100 professional fights.

His boyish looks and reserved manner belie his age and occupation, but broach the subject of boxing and his eyes light up, and you realize he's a warrior in disguise.

Pongsaklek comes from Nakhon Ratchasima – one of the poorest areas of the country where tradition remains extremely important. Reverence to the family is strong, and adolescents feel an obligation to provide for their parents and relatives.

Although most farm boys have limited educations, they do know it's possible to forge a better life through boxing.

Pongsaklek was one such boy. At the age of 12, he began training in Muay Thai.

Pongsaklek began fighting bouts once a month throughout

years he built up a 40-10 record and eventually fought at Bangkok's Lumpinee Stadium.

His boxing ability had always been superior to his Muay Thai skills, and after turning 17, he decided to make conventional boxing his exclusive profes-

the country. Over the next five rewards of boxing were potentially greater made the decision that much easier.

> Like most of Thailand's fighters, Pongsaklek lives a relatively Spartan lifestyle. He lives at the gym, sharing space with other fighters, only leaving after a fight to visit his mother.

A week or two later, he is back at the gym, working for his

family, his future and his legacy.

He is never out of shape, doesn't drink, smoke or carouse with women, and trains six days a week. He lives to fight and to support his family.

"Sometimes we've caught fighters getting complacent," Petchyindee Camp Administrator Charoenchai Suriyawut said.

"We don't ever have to

worry about this with Pongsaklek; he's very diligent."

Pongsaklek's work ethic has proved beneficial. Pongsaklek, 63-2 (31), has reigned as the WBC flyweight titleholder for nearly six years and has defended his belt 16 times since knocking out Filipino Malcolm Tunacao in March 2001 to win the title. Pongsaklek made his professional debut on December 21, 1994, scoring a third-round KO against Bernardo Jun Davalos in Bangkok. There are rumors of a late 2007 fight with IBF champion Vic Darchinyan. However, the bout has yet to be confirmed.

Meanwhile, with every victory and title defense, Pongsaklek inches closer to greatness.

He recently surpassed the record for flyweight title defenses and is rapidly closing in on the title-reign record of seven-plus years. He has publicly vowed to win 20 in a row before retiring.

It is unlikely that the reserved Pongsaklek will remain a public figure after he quits boxing. For Pongsaklek, all roads lead him back to his beloved family and farm in Isarn.

One design racing is considered by many as the ultimate form of yacht racing as there are no differences among the boats in the class, thus no handicaps. The fastest boat is determined by


the crew with the best tactics, skills and agility aboard, as well as determination and, of course, a touch of luck.

I dunno art, but I know what I like

odern art is for idiots. A bit strong, you may say, but how can an otherwise perfectly sane and rational segment of the population take a group of blobs, dots and accidents on canvas seriously?

Maybe I'm being unfair. Officially, modern art is defined as just about any art that "strays from portraying things realistically". That means that an even wider variety of pretentious nonsense can be viewed as "inspired" or "extraordinary" by men with goatee beards

or women with comfortable shoes. Not that I'm generalizing, of course.

I really believe that I'm not alone in this cynicism, and that a sizable portion of the Western world thinks that at least some, if not all modern art is a form of scam; a kind of fake art.

We have some classic examples of "artistic genius" that have made the news over the years. An unmade bed. Water pouring out of a tap into a sink. A pile of bricks. Plastic bags full of rubbish. All won prizes and sold for thousands.

When you see an Andy Warhol lithograph of someone's face in three colors or a Campbell's soup label, it's hard for the average person not to think that they could have done exactly the same thing themselves with very little effort, and suspect that Mr Warhol just chucked some paint on a canvas, splashed it around a bit and hyped it to the art world.

On the other hand, there are a couple of things that are abundantly clear. Firstly, the average person didn't create a Warhol litho; its weirdness proves that. More importantly perhaps, the average person wouldn't even have thought of it. It may sound as if I'm arguing against myself

here, but the fundamental point is that this stuff is still complete nonsense.

Jackson Pollock is another one – his stuff really is the ultimate in artistic cons. A canvas covered in a series of splashes, smudges and smears? Please. Next thing you know, they'll be calling elephant art masterpieces. Actually, come to think of it, they're both very similar...

Anyway, I think Jackson Pollocks's a complete buffoon. As Paul Hogan, the Australian actor, said in a beer commercial while looking at one of his paintings, "That's Pollock's".

He painted in what I can only presume is the same way as he thought – in a totally random fashions; you never knew what was coming next.

The plant world is generally a lot neater, better-organized and predictable. In contrast to most of its bedfellows, crotons do things a little differently – they are definitely not your average plant. I rather think that they come from

the Jackson Pollock side of the evolutionary chain – they just can't decide what color or shape they want to be.

Green and uniform they are certainly not. Their leaves are variegated, which just means that there are distinct different colors on one leaf. There are of course a number of variegated leaved plants around, but the croton, or *Codiaeum variegatum*, dares to be different, and takes this idea one step further.

As I write this page on a weekly basis, I should be able to describe precisely what a croton looks like, but honestly, I can't, as they're all totally dissimilar. There are certainly a few members of the family that look similar, but every single croton plant is unique.

They're usually a meter or two tall, and have at least six different leaf shapes, from long and narrow to wide and oval, or a kind of maple shape. Some even form themselves into corkscrew arrangements. The leathery, shiny leaves don't usually get any longer than about 15 centimeters.

The colors are without doubt the most amazing thing about this plant. Most varieties we see in Phuket have at least two, if not three combinations of colors on their leaves; green, yellow, pink or red. They also have as many names as there are varieties, but in Thai they are typically called *koson*.

Watching them grow is worthy of one of those time-lapse films you see on the National Geographic Channel. The green and red variety, for example, grows quickly and enthusiastically in plenty of sun, as you'd expect. What you wouldn't expect is that the new leaves are a completely different color from the lower

ones – they initially emerge as light green and yellow.

As they begin to grow, they look as if they just can't be bothered to be the right color, but over the next couple of weeks they muster a little energy and gusto, and eventually decide to change hues. By this stage, they look as if they belong to the rest of the plant.

It's thought that the croton came from Moloko in Indonesia, originally in an all-green form. Over time, this original variety produced a "sport", or an offshoot differing from the parent plant. Since then, crotons have continued to produce sports as offspring, and today, the seeds of the plant nearly always produce plants that look absolutely nothing like their parents. They should probably be from Manchester.

To this day, new hybrids are still being created, particularly in Thailand, where the plant is regarded as being a bearer of good luck. It also brightens up any spare sunny spot in the garden. It will put up with just about any treatment, but likes a fair bit of water. In a pot, it likes plenty of drainage, and will complain bitterly if the soil gets too muddy.

A sign that the croton is particularly content is when it produces clusters of small, nondescript flowers. They're nothing to write home about, but that's not a problem, as the plant is grown entirely for its spectacular foliage.

You could even bring your potted version indoors. Make sure it's near a window to give it plenty of light, but plenty of heat too. Crotons and air conditioning are not a happy combination.


If you're one of those who likes to walk round a garden trying to identify all plant life present, this one's easy in its own particular way. If the leaves are weirdly multi-colored and you haven't a clue what it is, it's probably a croton. I rather think that Mr. Pollock would have approved.
