Big reward for goldshop bandit

PHUKET: A 300,000-baht reward is on offer for information leading to the arrest of a brazen bandit who made off with gold jewelry worth more than one million baht in a daylight robbery on January 27.

Officers report they have been following tips called in by a woman claiming to be the robber's girlfriend, scouring the areas where she said he has been hiding, but without success.

Suthathip Jedipram, 28, an employee at Thongroj gold shop, in Dowroong Villa on Chao Fa East Rd, said that the robber walked into the shop, took out a gun and shouted at her and the other employees not to call for help or set off the alarm.

The robbery lasted about three minutes.

The robber looked thin and was wearing a denim jacket, camouflage trousers, a helmet, gloves and a long hair wig. He rode a motorbike without a license plate, she said.

Pol Maj Gen Decha Budnampetch, Commander of Phuket Provincial Police, told the Gazette, "The robber walked into the shop just 30 minutes after it opened, and at that time there were about three or four employees there. Nobody was hurt during the robbery even though the robber showed a gun.

"The shop lost about 107 bahtweight of gold, estimated to be worth more than one million baht. We have checked their CCTV to try to see the robber's face and more details so that we can arrest him.

"We believe it might be the

same person who committed another robbery in 2006, because he used the same method."

In that robbery, a lone gunman walked into BR Gold Shop, at the entrance of Dawroong Villa, wearing a full-face helmet, jacket and olive-colored pants. He took gold jewelry worth about 500,000 baht from the store before fleeing on a motorbike without a license plate.

In both robberies, no one was injured but the robber was able to ride off within minutes of entering the store.

Pol Lt Col Sompong Boonrat, Deputy Superintendent of Phuket City Police Station, reported that a woman from Bangkok called with a tip that the robber was hiding in Rawai.

Police searched the area, he said, but have yet to find the robber or his loot.

"I believe that he might still

be hiding in Phuket and we have instructed officers at the Tah Chat Chai checkpoint and the airport to keep a sharp eye out for anyone fitting his description.

"We might have a good chance to arrest him if the person reporting the tips is legitimate," Lt Col Sompong said.

Police are expected to release a sketch of the suspect's face soon.

A 300,000-baht reward is on offer for information leading to the suspect's arrest.

The Thongroj gold shop has put up 200,000 baht of the reward money, with the remainder to be paid by donations from the Phuket Goldseller's Association

Barami 8 squatters pull up stakes

KALIM: About eight months after receiving first eviction notices, squatters living on government land on Soi Phra Barami 8 have slowly begun moving out, fearing court-ordered fines and possible arrest if they stay in the area.

Poonsak Naksena, Chief Administrative Officer of Patong Municipality, told the *Gazette* that the squatters in the first three homes hit with court-ordered fines have vacated their homes in recent weeks.

The squatters in those homes had accrued fines of around 180,000 baht by the time the province ordered them forcibly removed if they did not vacate by November 10.

However, when the deadline came, the Municipality, fearing a riot, did not go through with the forced evictions.

Since the deadline, many residents have begun to leave the area, fearing their homes would be the next ones served with court orders, said K. Poonsak.

In addition to fear of arrest, the squatters may be tiring of living without power, which was cut off in mid-2006 in an effort to enforce the initial eviction notices served two months earlier.

After the power was cut, the villagers staged an angry protest at Provincial Hall, demanding a fair resettlement and restoration of power.

The province took a hard line with the villagers after they rejected a plan to be resettled on small plots of land owned by Wat Kathu, some six kilometers

Limo driver returns B200,000 in 'lost luggage'

PHUKET: Airport limousine driver Prateep Seeponnok has been commended for returning almost 200,000 baht worth of cash and goods to their Norwegian owner after they were left in his car.

K. Prateep, accompanied by Phuket Vice-Governor Worapot Rattasima and Tourist Police officers, returned the forgotten luggage to Rolf Bernharn Knobloch on January 30.

K. Prateep told the *Gazette*, "At 10 pm on January 29 I drove Mr Knobloch from Phuket International Airport to Patong.

"After I dropped Mr Knobloch off at The Royal Paradise Hotel, I didn't realize that he had left his bag in my car, so I drove off and parked beside a shop on the way to my house.

"It was then that I saw a bag, very similar to the car's interior color and easy to miss, behind the front seat. So I called the Tourist Police and reported it as lost property," he said.

K. Prateep explained that he turned the money in because it was the right thing to do – and because he was afraid of being arrested if he kept it.

Inside the bag Tourist Police found two smaller bags containing a brown wallet, a black zip wallet with 658 baht, a passport, 87,000 baht in cash, two airplane tickets, a Visa credit card, a bank card, a European travel insurance card, a Nokia mobile phone and charger, three pens and Norwegian kroner equal to 92,000 baht.

Tourist Police contacted Mr Knobloch and made arrangements to return his luggage.

Mr Knobloch was very appreciative and thanked K. Prateep and the Tourist Police.

K. Prateep received 1,000 baht as a reward for his honesty.

Phuket exempt from 'smile and wai' training

PHUKET: Immigration officers at Phuket International Airport are not required to undergo the "smile and *wai*" training that their counterparts at Suvarnbhumi Airport have been ordered to complete.

Thailand Immigration Bureau Commander Pol Lt Gen Suwat Tumrongsiskul ordered the 1,200 Immigration officers at Suvarnbhumi Airport to add a little warmth by smiling when welcoming visitors.

The order came after officials became concerned that tourists may be discouraged by immigration officers' hard-nosed behavior

The training, called the "Sawasdee Project", was developed by Suan Dusit Rajabhat University to help officers balance their dual roles of human lie detectors and national greeters, said Lt Gen Suwat.

He described the course as a "personality modification program" that also aims to develop officers' skills for vetting suspicious characters.

However, Phuket Airport Immigration Office Superintendent Pol Col Surasak Atthapanyawanich told the *Gazette* that his officers have been conducting similar service training at monthly meetings for more than a year.

"This project is good because we work

The training, called the "Sawasdee" in the service sector. It helps the officers in being service-minded.

"Once a month, every month, I train my officers about ethics, being serviceminded and how to speak good, polite English," he said.

"We have had good feedback about us smiling and being friendly, which is very satisfying for us and for all the organizations we deal with," he added.

Pol Col Ittipon Atchariyapradit, who was promoted to Superintendent of Phuket Immigration Office on November 1, said, "We already have similar training, and we have had good responses from people who have come to our office."

Ya bah dealer escapes after high-speed car chase

PHUKET CITY: After overturning his car in a high-speed chase with police officers, a suspected ya bah (methamphetamine) dealer eluded police and a sniffer dog team from Phuket Provincial Special Operations Unit in woodland near Baan Kuku, Tambon Rassada, on January 29.

Pol Lt Col Sermpan Sirikong, Deputy Superintendent (Criminal Investigation) of Phuket City Police Station, told the *Gazette* that police had two warrants for the arrest of Phuket native Apisit Ninpan, 24, on drug charges. One of the warrants was issued in Bangkok, the other in Phuket. The tip-off that led to the arrest attempt came from Apisit's girlfriend.

"His girlfriend came to the police station to report that he had stolen her car and she wanted us to get it back. She did not know that her name was also on the arrest warrant from Phuket. Now we have arrested her and will hold her at Phuket City Police Station until she appears in court. I am not sure why the couple came back to Phuket from Bangkok," Col Sermpan said.

The raid, carried out with the help of officers from Phang Nga-based Border Patrol Police Unit 425, was the largest reported drug seizure in recent memory.

Phuket Provincial Chief Administrative Officer (*Palad*) Piya Bharatasilapin told the *Gazette* that officers also seized about 40,000 baht in cash, four gold necklaces with a combined weight of 13 baht (195 grams), and a .38 revolver from the suspects.

Legionella scare sparks course in disease control

PATONG: Dr Wiwat Sitamanod of the Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) announced that the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) is investigating claims that six tourists contracted Legionnaire's disease while on holiday in Patong.

"The PPHO received a fax from a foreign embassy on January 9 about some of their nationals who were diagnosed as having Legionnaire's disease after being on holiday in Phuket.

"On January 10 we investigated this claim and then held a meeting to discuss this with 50 hotels in Patong. Now foreign countries have placed emphasis [on this] and are watching Phuket," he said on January 24.

Dr Wiwat declined to name the two hotels involved.

However, the MoPH website states that five tourists who have contracted the disease – two Swedes, two Finns and one Norwegian – stayed at one hotel in Phuket.

A Belgian tourist, staying at have taken.

a different hotel on the island, was later also confirmed as having contracted the disease.

The website states that the first five tourists were staying at a 400-room hotel that, under supervision of the PPHO, has since undertaken extensive cleaning of its air conditioning system, cooling towers and water supply.

Dr Wiwat was speaking at a seminar entitled "Protection and Control of Legionnaire's" at Phuket Graceland Resort & Spa in Patong. The event was attended by more than 400 hotel employees from Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi.

In addition, a workshop was held for some 90 technicians from Phuket hotels to train them in how to keep all equipment free of *Legionella* bacteria.

"Now, within two weeks of the report [claiming that Legionnaire's disease was contracted in Phuket] we must report to the European Working Group for Legionella Infections [EWGLI] the results of our investigations and what control measures we have taken "We must [focus on this problem] this until they are satisfied with what measures we have taken," Dr Wiwat said.

Leaflets handed out at the seminar explained that if EWGLI is not satisfied with corrective measures taken, the organization will post on its website the names of the hotels where the disease was believed to have been contracted.

The notice will be posted for two years, or until EWGLI is satisfied with remedial action taken.

Dr Wanchai, Chief of the PPHO, said, "I don't want to announce the names of the hotels... PPHO officers have checked and already have the situation under control."

To boost tourist confidence in hotels that are not sources of the disease, the PPHO has launched its "Golden Certified" project.

Hotels can apply to be inspected by the PPHO, which will assess what policies and procedures the hotel has in place to protect against Legionnaire's Disease.

Slow progress in encroachment probe

NAI HARN: The investigation into the building of a resort on protected forest land at Ao Sane is making slow progress, though police expect to make more arrests soon, Chalong Police told the *Gazette*.

Some 30 forestry officials raided the illegal construction site on October 25. Two construction foremen, Virot Niyomdechai, 31, of Satun Province, and Viriya Yimsomboon, 25, of Nakhon Pathom, were arrested and their equipment was seized.

Virot and Viriya were charged with violating Article 54 of the Forestry Act of 1941, Article 14 of the Forest Conservation Act of 1964 and Article 360 of the Penal Code.

At the time of the raid the site had 12 buildings in various stages of completion.

"We know who the owner of that resort is but we can't tell you because the investigation is

on-going. More people are involved in this case, and we plan to charge those persons soon," Pol Lt Col Chokchai Sutthimek of Chalong Police told the *Gazatta*

"Muang District Chief Weerawat Janpen has held many meetings about this case, but we need time to gather more evidence. The two men we arrested have denied the charges in court. So now we must get more information from the Phuket Forestry Office," he added.

Aroon Solot, President of Rawai Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*), said that construction work had now indeed stopped. "After Muang District Chief Administrative Officer (*Palad*) Techin Weerawong and forestry officials raided the site there has been no further building work. I have ordered the *OrBorTor* Rawai Civil Engineering department to check the site to be sure that building work does not recommence," he explained.

Police arrest Phang Nga murder suspect in Patong

PHUKET: Tourist Police have apprehended Wanasart "Bank" Jeensrikong, 23, for his role in the June 28, 2003, murder of Sarawuth Yamying in Phang Nga's Takuatung District.

Following a tip-off, the suspect was arrested on January 25 after he was found working as a chef at a hotel in Patong. Plainclothes police arrested the suspect at the hotel, which they declined to name.







he uneasy truce between meter-taxis and the Phuket Limousine and Business Services Co-operative (PBC) over the right to pick up passengers at Phuket International Airport (PIA) took a turn for the worse at 8 am on January 21, when about 100 PBC members went on strike.

Drivers of the limousines refused to pick up fares and blocked access to the airport parking lot to rival meter-taxis.

The protest, the latest in a long line of conflicts over the years, saw a mad scramble by airport authorities to arrange buses to shuttle tourists into town so they could arrange transfers to their destinations.

The strike was instigated by the mysterious arrival of a new "meter-taxi" stand at 2 am that morning. The stand was positioned prominently on the main arrivals concourse – traditionally the sole domain of the PBC, which pays more than 1.3 million baht to the airport for the right to operate there.

PBC President Manot Chusak told the *Gazette*, "I saw meter-taxi drivers use a truck to move their counter beside the exit door, and the President of the Phuket Private Meter Taxi Association (PPMTA) was directing the action.

"It's not fair for the limousine drivers, because we signed a legal agreement with metertaxi drivers and they aren't following it, so I want to talk with the government, PIA staff and meter-taxi representatives," he said.

K. Manot was referring to a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed in mid-2006. The MoU allowed the PBC to keep their concession provided they improved their service, allowed meter-taxis and the Airport Bus service to continue operating there – and pay a 10% increase in the concession price.

When the PPMTA first set up at the airport in 2002, following a steady stream of complaints to the provincial government about the PBC's service and prices, they were initially allowed a small counter at the back of the

parking lot. Out of view of most new arrivals, the cheaper service became a hit, but only with those who were aware of it.

About seven months ago, following an agreement hammered out by Phuket Provincial Chief Administrative Officer (*Palad*) Nivit Aroonrat, the PPMTA set up a counter at a more strategic location, beneath the ramp leading up to the departure hall one floor above arrivals.

Upon leaving his native Phuket in December, Palad Nivit told the *Gazette* that resolving the dispute between the PPMTA and the limo drivers was his greatest accomplishment in office.

However, one detail was missing from that agreement:

whether or not the meter-taxis and the Airport Bus would be able to open counters on the arrivals concourse, as they do at most international airports.

The unexpected arrival of the new, air-conditioned metertaxi counter in such a prime location was a breach of the MoU, K. Manot maintained. "They have breached the agreement, so maybe they should be banned from the airport. They have caused problems here many times before," he said.

"And I want to talk with the Governor about the number of taxis allowed," he added. "There are four personal taxis here, and 40 more with the Phuket Private Meter-Taxi Association."

Fortunately, the tense stand-off on January 21 ended non-violently at 5 pm with the removal of the offending counter, which was last reported seen well out of sight behind the airport fire station. People seeking a metertaxi can still get one at the old spot, beneath the departure ramp.

PPMTA President Suwun Tamchu denied having any involvement in physically installing the new counter. Another outfit, the Phuket Taxi Meter Company, must have been responsible, he said.

The PPMTA and the Phuket Taxi Meter Company (PTMC) are not the same, K. Suwun explained.

The PPMTA has 40 cars while the PTMC has just four cars. All taxis from both groups must pay the airport 40 baht per fare, and passengers using either service must pay a 100-baht fee

at the counter. This amount stays with the PPMTA or PTMC.

However, it is the PTMC that negotiates with the airport authorities, who in turn answer to Airports of Thailand (AoT) in Bangkok, he said.

Notably, K. Suwun admitted that the controversial counter was built by the PPMTA at a cost of 120,000 baht and with the understanding that the PPMTA could install it themselves outside the arrivals door.

However, AoT in Bangkok had later instructed its personnel at Phuket Airport that only the PTMC could install it, since it held a contract with AoT and the PPTMA did not.

The counter was then sold to the PTMC for 100,000, with the understanding that both groups would use it, K. Suwun said.

However, he insisted the

installation of the counter on January 21 came as a surprise. "What were they thinking? Why did they do that when we were quite happy operating at the current counter under the ramp?" he

K. Suwun said he wanted to set up a meeting with the PTMC, but that its owner had changed his mobile phone number and could no longer be contacted. Repeated efforts by the Gazette to contact the owner have also been unsuccessful.

PIA Director Sq/Ldr Pornchai Eua-aree confirmed that the PTMC had permission to set up the booth where it was installed on January 21.

"That location provides better access for people seeking a meter-taxi, and that is the airport's primary concern," he said.

The call from the PBC's K. Manot to restrict the number of taxis at the airport seems to be a needless request. The counter move shows a drive to get more passengers, and K. Suwun said that the PPMTA has no plans to increase the fleet of meter-taxis operating out of the airport, because the current number is the maximum that low-season passenger demand can sustain.

He added that the Airport Bus service, launched in October 2005, had not affected business.

'We have different markets. The Airport Bus targets backpackers while we target people with lots of luggage," he said.

However, Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit told the Gazette that the province had denied a request to allow more metertaxis to operate there, saying that the number of taxis now in service was sufficient to meet demand. The Gazette could not identify exactly who had applied to have more taxis there.

Gov Niran added that he thought the dispute between the limos and the meter-taxis had been resolved with the MoU signed last July.

"We want to make everything in order at the airport, especially public transportation. In the past the PBC had a sole concession to operate there, but we had many requests by Thais and foreigners alike to allow the meter-taxis in," he said.

Friction is likely to remain between the taxi drivers and the airport limousine drivers, especially as the meter-taxis offer cheaper fares. K. Suwun said the PPTMA would like to increase its rates, but could not do so without sacrificing its competitive advantage on price.

Currently, people using meter-taxis save about 120 baht on trips to Patong and about 200 baht on trips to Kata-Karon, he

Reports that meter-taxi drivers often refuse to turn on their meters and instead try to negotiate a higher rate when dealing with with foreign passengers were untrue, he added.

The issue was raised at a provincial level meeting in December, when Governor Niran reported having received numerous complaints on the matter.

Police inspected meter-taxis at checkpoints during the holiday season drunk-driving crackdown to ensure their meters were turned on.

Traffic Inspector Pol Maj Teerawat Leamsuwan of the Phuket City Police, who coordinated the effort, told the Gazette after the holiday period that no violators were found.





Queer News

RAWAI: Outraged residents of Village 2 are demanding the immediate removal of numerous *Sivaleung* (Shiva's member, or *lingam*) statues that decorate a newly-built spa, claiming that the phalluses will embarrass tourists and other passers-by.

On January 20 Aroon Solos, President of the Rawai Tambon Administration Organization, paid a visit to the Suppaya Spa (Suppaya means "Assets of the Supreme One"), a 100-room facility located along the road from Kata to Karon.

K. Aroon was not going for a massage, but rather to convey the displeasure of local residents about the wall surrounding the spa's grounds, which is adorned with numerous pillars built in the shape of erect male penises, each inscribed with Hindi script.

Work on the facility, built with Board of Investment privileges, began about three years ago, K Aroon learned.

"This means the spa [and the lingam surrounding it] were built in part with government money," K. Aroon told the *Gazette*.

The spa is now almost complete, but has yet to begin operations, he added.

K. Aroon has asked the Phuket Provincial Culture Office to try and persuade the spa to cover up or move the offending images.

For some Hindu believers, the lingam are sacred symbols for the worship of the Hindu god Shiva.

However there aren't many Hinduists in Rawai, where most residents are Muslims, Thai Bud-

dhists, Muslims, new-age mystics – or just alcoholics.

The statues have created a real conundrum for K. Aroon, who wants to respect the religious beliefs of the spa's owners while at the same time quelling public outcry.

During his visit, K. Aroon met with the spa's operations manager, who explained that the

statues reflected the spa owner's religious convictions and were intended to generate brisk trade, not offend.

K. Aroon told the manager the location of the statues so close to a public road was inappropriate for a tourist place such as Phuket and asked if they could be removed or covered up – although he did not say with what.

As this edition goes to print, the phalluses remained proudly standing in all their lifelike glory.

However, following a meeting including the spa owner, K. Aroon and a representative from Phuket Provincial Culture Office on January 26, K. Aroon told the *Gazette* that the spa owner had agreed to modify the statues so that the pillars will be topped in-

stead with images of lotus flowers.

In the meantime, the *Gazette* hears that some local residents have already taken to calling the stretch of road past the spa as "Dildo Drive" and that people are traveling from other parts of the island to view the island's newest icons.

It also covered many other things, such as shaping people's attitudes toward improving their lives and could be applied to fields other than agriculture.

The project will focus on moderation, good virtues, knowledge and self-sufficiency, he said.

Pusacha Donavanik, Executive Vice-President of JSL Co, said the company would produce the project's media materials, including TV, Internet and onthe-road activities to reach nationwide audiences so they could pursue 'sufficiency economy' in their daily lives.

Everybody's happy: A new study seeking to measure the Gross Domestic Happiness (GDH) of people aged between 12 and 24 in metropolitan Bangkok found that they were "quite happy" with their lives. Assumption University's Abac Poll and Srinakharinwirot University's psychology students jointly conducted the poll, surveying happiness, leisure time and quality of life of 1,564 youths. The average GDH score was 3.52 out of 5, indicating they were quite con-

Helluva heist: Thieves in Songkhla's Haad Yai District ran off with an ATM, which had been filled with 2.45 million baht a day earlier.

Sathaporn Nilpradab, 43, a security guard at nearby Songkhla Social Security Office, told police that five men in a white pickup truck arrived around 2 am. Two men pointed a gun at his head, tied him up and threatened to kill him if he did not remain silent, he

"I was in shock and constantly begged for my life," said the security guard, adding that he could not remember any of the thieves' faces.

Two men used a two-wheel cart to haul the Krung Thai Bank ATM onto the truck before speeding away.

It all happened in 10 minutes, the guard said.

Number crunching: The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) is slashing the 2008 tourist-arrival target from 20 million to 16 million as it switches its tactics from quantity to quality.

Newly appointed TAT Governor Pornsiri Manoharn said the original target was too high and did not match the goal of becoming a leading world destination in terms of quality.

Citing concerns about how Thailand can survive in the global tourism industry with old destinations, low returns and a degraded environment, K. Pornsiri said it was time to change the national strategy.

To pursue quality travelers,

attract tourists from the regular target markets, while trying to explore new markets, particularly the Middle East and Eastern Europe. At present, 65% of tourists are from the Asia-Pacific region, she said.

However, this year the TAT is aiming for 14.8 million foreign visitors, up 18% from 2006. These tourists are expected to spend 547 billion baht, a 13% in-

Domestic travelers are expected to make 82 million trips. generating 577 billion baht.

Push for cheap drugs: Thailand is planning to "legally" break the patents of three more drugs, two of which are medications for HIV treatment and the other for the country's most common type of heart disease, Public Health Minister Dr Mongkol na Songkhla announced.

The country is in critical need of the drugs, yet cannot afford to cover the cost of treatment due to the limited healthcare budget, he said.

There were more drugs being considered for compulsory licensing (CL), he said.

"We are not simply going to

the TAT needs unique tactics to do CL on more and more drugs, but only the drugs in critical need that the state cannot afford to buy...CL is legitimate domestically and internationally. Thailand is not the first to do compulsory licensing," he said.

> Pollution control: Residents of Rayong's Muang District should seek a court order forcing the National Environment Board (NEB) to declare Map Ta Phut Industrial Estate a pollution-control area, environmental lawyer Surachai Trong-ngam said.

> K. Surachai advised unhappy residents to ask the Administrative Court for an Environmental Protection Act ruling over an NEB decision to delay imposing a pollution-control zone on the estate, home to 89 factories.

> The NEB on January 11 decided to delay imposing the measure following a recommendation from the Pollution Control Department, which said Map Ta Phut was polluted by at least 40 dangerous compounds, including cancer-causing agents.



Tip-off leads to big ganja bust

egion 4 Border Patrol Police arrested four suspects and seized nearly a quarter of a tonne of cannabis in a raid in Haad Yai District, Songkhla.

The seizure was announced on January 23 at a press conference at the Border Patrol Police Headquarters in Songkhla's Muang District. Pol Col Nikhom Sonsri, Deputy Commander of Border Patrol Police Region 4, said police had been tipped off that a large-scale cannabis dealer would be sending a delivery to a customer in the province.

After further investigation, police located the Haad Yai hotel where the dealer was staying.

At 10 pm January 22, officers stopped a blue Mitsubishi Strada pickup on Lopburiramesuan Rd in Haad Yai.

A search of the vehicle uncovered 214 one-kilogram packages of pressed cannabis hidden in a secret compartment built into the truck's roof upholstery.

Police arrested four suspects: Kitthisak Thaweesuk, 47: Sukot Matlee, 54; Num Chinbun, 22; and a 17-year-old identified only as "Aek". All four suspects confessed and were charged with possession of a Class 5 drug with the intent to supply.

Police discovered that the four had brought the cannabis from Amnat Charoen Province with the intention of selling it to a customer in Sadao, whence it would be smuggled into Malaysia.

Pornographic promotion: Two hotels in Nakhon Sri Thammarat City were busted in the early hours of January 24 for showing pornography to lure customers.

The first raid was at 1 am on the Saowalak Hotel in Tambon Thasak. Pol Maj Sathapon Phatanarak, a Crime Suppression Inspector at Nakhon Sri Thammarat Muang District Police Station, checked into the hotel in plain clothes with other officers. A hotel employee then turned on an "obscene VCD" for their entertainment.

Maj Sathapon arrested the hotel manager, Napharat Lekmat, 19, on charges of possession and public broadcasting of obscene material. Six VCDs were seized as evidence.

Half an hour later, the same unit raided the Jongrak Villa Resort in Tambon Paknakhon. The officers used the same method and arrested hotel manager Samphan Thongkaemkaew on the same charges. They also seized 53 VCDs.

Samphan confessed that he provided pornography free-ofcharge to "short time" hotel guests. The service made him very popular with guests, he said.

Palm power: The first biodiesel plant in Thailand, producing a daily output of 10,000 tonnes, will begin production in Surat Thani province next month.

The prototype plant, located in Kanchanadit District, is owned and operated by the Surat Thani Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*). The facility will produce biodiesel fuel using palm oil supplied mainly by local growers. The alternative fuel will be used by trucks and other vehicles with diesel engines.

Biodiesel produced at the 18.5-million-baht plant, which has yet to be named, will cost users Luek and Nation newspapers.

only slightly more than the untaxed diesel that is sold exclusively to fishing boats.

Lethal love: Somrak Niluang, 15, was shot dead on January 23 by a love rival in Nakhon Sri Thammarat's Phibun District.

Kai (not his real name), also 15, told police that he, Somrak and a third boy were on their way home when they encountered two members of a rival gang, Jos, 16, and Jeng, 17 (not their real names).


Jos reached into a fertilizer sack he was carrying and pulled out a shotgun, Kai said.

Somrak's group fled, but Jos managed to shoot Somrak once in the back, Kai explained to the police. Somrak died at the

The investigating officer, Pol Capt Nit Kanjanawong from Phibun District Police Station, said that Jos and Jeng had already left the area and police were preparing evidence to request arrest warrants.

The motive for the killing was a dispute between rival groups of youths sparked by Somrak and Jos both pursuing the same girl, Capt Nit said.

Brit survives brutal hit-and-run

riton Marilyn Shein was taking a morning walk for her health, but was lucky to escape with her life when a truck hit her from behind along the roadside in the Bang Po district of Koh Samui.

Ms Shein owns a villa at the luxury Napasai Resort on the north coast of Samui and was taking a four-day fast at the nearby Samui Detox Center. The morning walk was part of the program and a guide from the detox center and another participant from the UK joined Marilyn on the walk.

The truck driver, who later fled the scene, pulled out to overtake another truck and drove straight into Ms Shein while trying to avoid an oncoming car. She heard the vehicle approach and turned to see what the noise was. Her head then smashed the truck's windscreen and she was thrown into the air, suffering broken ribs, a punctured lung and severe damage to her hand. The two other people suffered minor injuries.

A foreign-run developer, Sabai Properties, owns the truck in question, and the company has accepted full responsibility for the accident, agreeing to cover the victims' medical bills and deal with insurance matters.

Ms Shein owns a company herself and has had to cancel important meetings in China while she recovers in Samui's Bandon International Hospital. She needed more than 100 stitches in her head and will also require surgery on her finger.

"It's bad but it could have been worse," she said. "My main concern apart from the pain is that the driver is not facing the consequences. But the emergency services and medical care have been excellent. I also have my daughters here, which is a great comfort."

Police know the driver's identity and are conducting an island-wide search.

Large trucks that transport construction material and supplies pose an ever-increasing threat to road users and tourists on Samui. Many of the drivers are young and reckless, with a reputation for using stimulants. Local companies that own these trucks tend

to charge per job, which means the faster they drive, the more money they make.

Money artist nabbed: In mid-January, Police Inspector Surasak Thiprat and a team from the Samui Police Station obtained a permit to raid an advertising shop on the island where they suspected false bank notes were being produced.

On searching the premises, officers found two 1,000-baht notes that proved to be forgeries, a special computer program used to design the notes and a 40,000 baht printer.

The owner of the shop, known only as Khun Panya, later confessed to printing fake money and passing it to his friends, who used it to buy goods around the island. He could not say exactly how many notes he had produced, but admitted that it totaled a substantial amount.

Although the designs were almost identical to authentic 1,000-baht notes, their creator said the paper used was slightly thicker than regular bank notes.

Police spent the following day contacting local banks and shops, warning them to be on the look-out for suspicious bank notes. But with such a high transient population on the island, Inspector Surasak said it would be

very difficult to trace and remove all the counterfeit money from the

Police extortion probe ordered: The Commander of the Surat Thani police force, Maj Gen Wibhun Bangthanai, recently ordered an inquiry into claims that local police extorted money from a tourist on Koh Pha-ngan.

Daniel Dane, 23, a military officer on holiday from Canada, reported the incident to the local police and also notified his em-

Mr Dane said a man in uni-

form stopped him for a minor traffic violation, then demanded 15.000 baht in cash. When Mr Dane could not produce the cash. he was escorted to an ATM machine to withdraw the sum.

Gen Wibhun ordered a probe to establish which, if any, of the island's police officers were involved in the extortion. The Commander says he is taking the claim very seriously, and is particularly concerned about the island's reputation, since the crime was also reported to the Canadian Embassy.

Scot arrested on heroine **charge:** On December 22 at 10

pm, Pol Col Bhunma Geawlaiyat from the Samui police and Captain Teerasak Buasuwan from the Tourist Police arrested Ian Morrison, a 40-year-old Scot, at his home in Mae Nam district.

Officers found a bag of heroine in the house, as well as a set of weighing scales and 10 tablets of methamphetamine, or "ice". A list of customers written in English was also discovered, as well as a comprehensive record of drug sales, with orders totaling around 10 million baht.

Police took Mr Morrison to the Samui Police Station for questioning. He denied involvement in drug dealing. The investigation continues.

Goodwill Games: Surat Thani is the host province for the national Goodwill Games 2007. The events will take place in three main venues around the province, one of which is on Koh Samui.

The games attract competitors from all over the country, who will compete in a total of 28 sports. Samui will host five main events: shooting, beach volleyball, tae kwon do, snooker and canoing. The other two venues for competitions will be in Surat Thani Town and at the Raja Prapa Dam complex.

On February 2, a planning meeting took place with members of the Samui Municipality and the Provincial Sports Department. The games will start on March 20 and last for a whole month.

Volunteers help out at Immigration

former pilot, a former British Royal Marine Commando and a former fire department chief may sound like a nursery rhyme motley crew found in a riding in a bathtub, but they are instead increasingly becoming the first line of local information for tourists in Patong.

As Tourist Police volunteers, these men already help tourists by giving directions and recommendations, and help to resolve disputes as they patrol the streets with Thai Tourist Police officers.

Now, however, they are using their skills to tackle one of the trickier problems for tourists: extending their holidays through the Immigration Office in Patong.

Tim Gardener, Assistant Group Leader of the Tourist Police volunteers, explained that the volunteers were asked to help out at Patong Immigration. To Mr Gardener, a former pilot, the task seemed only natural as the prime propose of the volunteers is to help tourists by providing infor-

"We have 15 nationalities and 31 languages and dialects represented," he said, adding that one of the volunteers speaks 11

languages, including many dialects of Chinese.

"We are slowly training everyone, and once they're trained they don't even have to be in the office to give advice. We will be able to phone the Russian chap, or the Hungarian chap, the Romanian, Greek, et cetera, and just do it over the phone, which wasn't done before," he said.

"If someone who speaks a tourist's language isn't in the office, they'd be only a phone call away," he added.

Immigration office has already had a positive impact. "At least 100 people come here every day," Mr Gardner said. "And, as you can see, there are no queues. Usually at this time [3 pm] there are long queues."

"Half of the questions we get can be answered in under five seconds," he added. "These poor chaps [the Thai Immigration officers] are stamping and writing for six hours a day, and it requires a lot of their concentration to make sure the stamp is correct.

"We're pre-processing, almost pre-screening, which makes the Immigration officers' work a good deal easier," he said.

Of the 34 foreigners signed up to help the Tourist Police, 20 "patrol" officers have been invited to help out at Patong Immigration. "We have two fullytrained officers at the Immigration Office, and eight more are undergoing training," Mr Gardner said, adding that the aim is have a volunteer there every day.

The training manual, including 20 Immigration forms and their explanations in English, is about 70 pages long and must be understood by each officer before he or she is allowed to give advice, he explained.

The most frequent requests Having the volunteers at the by tourists at the office involve

30-day extensions to stay for tourists traveling on visas issued outside the country, and sevenday extensions for those with visas issued on arrival.

More complex matters, including matters involving non-immigrant visas and work permits, are referred to the main Immigration Office in Phuket City, where the volunteers plan to set up office before next high season.

Why do these volunteers spend their free time this way? Especially when there are so many other ways to pass time on this island?

Frank Tomenson said he became a volunteer because other volunteers had been so helpful to him during his vacations in Phuket before he moved here.

Richard Johnson said that he especially wanted to help people because he found the process confusing when he was a tourist. "I had a lot of questions when I came here and there was no one to help me," he explained.





Over a loaded plate of superb antipasti – imported salamis and Prosciutto di San Daniele, candyfloss-soft Mozzarella di Bufala, olives and rosemary focaccia - we learn more about Francesco. Almost as much an academic as a chef - three sommelier courses in as many years, for example – cooking is in his blood.

"My destiny was written," he states. "My mother was a chef, as was my grandmother, Karoline, who was Hungarian. She was the family chef of the Rothschilds in Paris in the 1930s."

Heritage indeed.

Francesco is also a bit of a food scientist, and an admirer of Ferran Adrià of El Bulli fame, who also began his culinary career in the army.

Someone, possibly me, mentions the word "margarine". Claude looks vaguely concerned; he knows that margarine is a red flag to Francesco. The air turns electric with the Exec Chef's coruscating but learned damning of the middle-age spread loaded with trans fat.

"Why not use butter?" asks Francesco.

But then the primo – in fact a sampler of three dishes, a porcini risotto, bucatini Sugo all'amatriciana and ravioli - arrives and is consumed ignoring the politesse of speaking with one's mouth open. So much good food, good company, good conversation and good wine.

Lovers of cute calves – no, not the part of the leg behind the shin – may prefer not to read that I plumped for veal for my secondo. The veal is so tender it appears to fall apart, as if offering itself to me, before the knife.

A medley of vegetables contorno – for my dining companions, who are tucking into chicken in a saffron and cream sauce and a beef dish obviously so delectable that Claude refuses me permission to photograph it.

We gently progress through the rest of the traditional Italian menu with dolce, caffè and ammazzacaffè in the form of – what else from a dynamic, forwardthinking Sardinian chef steeped in tradition - mirto.

The conversation continues, covering all from hotel occupancy rates (deemed "very good") to food to politics to food to the crisis in Umami and everything under the sun.

Perhaps not all diners or guests at Uncle Nan's at The Bay Hotel will have the distinct pleasure of Claude and Francesco's company for an entire meal. We did, and it made what was an exceptional meal into one of the most memorable dining experiences the mem and I have enjoyed.

o the casual customer or passerby, there is no indication of the troubled past of Amnat Singhol – nicknamed "Man", and hence "Ice Cream Man".

Man comes across as sim-

ply happy; he doesn't allow his former nature to overwhelm him. "Everyone has had a troubled past," he says.

When he was a teenager, from about 15 to 18 years old, Man was often drunk from morning to night, and constantly involved in fights.

"If you'd met me 20 years ago, you'd probably have been scared to talk to me, because I was a bad boy. I simply accepted my hot-

tempered nature at that time.

"I was always involved in gun and knife fights with my enemies. I wasn't scared of anyone.

"I nearly went to prison three times on assault and weapons charges. If I had any problems with others, I didn't give in to them.

"My brother and I were

very bad boys. Together, we would fight all-comers; he was always very protective of me, so I really love him," Man says.

He has his brother to thank

for his new life. "When I was young, my

father bought ice cream equipment for my brother. He didn't have a job and dad felt sorry for him and wanted to get him started in business.

"At that time I was still a teenager, and I wanted to be a soldier but I couldn't be because I was overweight. When I was about 21, I was working at an alcohol shop when my brother asked me, 'Do you want to be an employee forever?'

That was the turning point of my life," Man explains.

Soon after, Man went to work at the ice cream shop, where his brother taught him the secrets of making ice cream.

He has been working in the business since, for about 16 years now, and feels that his brother is like a father to him.

Although Man still buys ice

cream from his brother, he now has his own portable operation, with motorcycle and refrigeration equipment.

Man's ice cream is very popular. "Sometimes I am so busy

scooping ice cream that I don't have time to look up and see my customers' faces," he says.

What is the secret to his success, and why does his ice cream taste so good?

"I don't have a special recipe, it's just normal ice cream, but I always have a cheerful word for my customers who have some problems in their lives.

want ice cream, just someone who understands them. I mean, you must sympathize with people; every day they have to deal with the cruel world and the demands of other people. At least I'm someone who can cheer them up a little.

"As for my ice cream flavors, they aren't the same every day, I have seven different ones: coconut, vanilla, corn, cantaloupe, mixed fruit, chocolate and jack fruit. I also offer seven toppings: corn in syrup, sticky rice, potato in syrup, pineapple in syrup, peanuts, palm tree seeds and soy beans. Two scoops are only 10 baht, and you can help yourself to toppings."

Sometimes Man lets children scoop their own ice cream – making him their hero after school.

day at Surin Rd and Soi 2, then on to Soi Bornam in town, and then Saphan Hin, where I stop to have lunch until 1 pm. Then it's on to Luang Por Rd near the Ocean Shopping Mall and Robinson department store.

"My last stop is in front of the Bangkok Bank on Phang Nga Rd until 5 pm, then it's back home. This last place has a lot of customers, especially children. They are so cute, especially when they want to try to scoop ice cream by themselves. It's a happy time for me, and I think for whoever passes by as well."

At the end of the day Man goes home to his sister's house in Srisuchart Grandview Village, as he doesn't have a home to call his own yet. "My big dream is to have a little house in Phuket. I'm 37 years old now but I don't have enough money to buy a house. That's because I didn't start to save money until late in life."

Man doesn't want a shop like his brother has because that would cost a lot of money. "The important thing," he says, "is that my ice cream tastes better than other shops."

Usually Man takes in about 1,500 baht a day in sales, and sometimes he is commissioned to provide many boxes of ice cream at about 2,000 baht each for office parties, which is quite lucrative for him.

However, the margins are small and he makes only about 8,000 baht a month after paying all bills.

But Man isn't in the ice cream business for the money; he does it for the love of the job and his customers – and his girlfriend.

"I have a girlfriend who loves me. She has gone to Taiwan to work for three years and she will come back next year," he said.

"Now I'm waiting for her to come back so we can look for a house together; that is my dream."







A brace of bracing cocktails

he Phurita Bar and restaurant at the Phulin Resort Karon is a good place to sip a cocktail or two while enjoying the quiet poolside scenery.

Ratchpisake Changphauk, Food and Beverage Manager at the Phulin, said there are two particularly popular concoction there at the moment.

The first is the exotic "Phulay", a Thai portmanteau meaning "between hill and sea" (*phu* in Thai is hill, and *lay* means sea)

The second is the "Kwam-Sook", named after the Thai word meaning happiness and contentment.

Both cocktails are the creations of bartender Sayan Wanthong, who has worked at the Phurita since opening in October 2005. He said that his two formulas are refreshing and relaxing.

"Phulay is a green cocktail, with a tangy sourness balanced by just the right of sweetness," says K. Sayan.



He notes that the Phulay tends to be popular with women whereas the orange-colored Kwam-Sook is more of a hit right across the gender divide, including those in the middle of the di-

Apart from having the zest of orange and pineapple, a dash of lime gives it a penetrating but

not overpowering sourness that kicks in slowly after the initial sunburst of sweetness starts to fade.

For both recipes, pour all ingredients into a shaker and add ice, then shake about 15-20 seconds before pouring into glass – then enjoy.

The Phulay should be serv-

ed with ice, the Kwam-Sook without.

The recipes for the two cocktails, as listed above, are not set in stone.

"You can adapt the recipe to suit your taste – but don't change it too much or you may get a strange taste," K. Sayan warns.



The Estée Lauder Prime FX Pro Concealment Kit includes concealers of different shades, such as a "red corrector" and a "blue corrector".


A red-based corrector works to conceal blemishes, broken capillaries and to brighten. A blue-based concealer will cover dark spots, under eye circles and even freckles.

aking its debut at the North America International Auto Show (NAIAS) in Detroit, the new Rolls-Royce Phantom Drophead Coupé is the ultimate in motoring decadence. It exudes quality from stem to stern, and although it is clearly based on the Phantom sedan, the Drophead has, says Rolls-Royce, something like 1,300 new parts specially developed for the car. Every exterior panel of the new car is original, with carefully considered proportions more suited to the shorter body.

As with the Phantom, the new car has a long hood and 20-inch wheels, emphasizing its majestic appearance. Visually, the convertible actually works better than the closed car, possibly due to its lower, neater lines.

"This car gave us the chance to think about the very nature of convertible motoring and in particular what it means to Rolls-Royce," said Chief Designer Ian Cameron. "Above all we were determined to make this car a joy to live with, and engineered it to give years of effortless service to its owner."

Two visually stunning features of the new Phantom are the optional brushed stainless steel hood and the rear teak decking, both carried over from the 100 EX concept that appeared at the Geneva show in 2004 to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Mr Rolls

meeting Mr Royce. The brushed finish of the hood and A-pillar are reminiscent of the classic Phantoms of the '20s and '30s, while the rear deck comprises more than 30 individual pieces of teak, protected by a special blend of oils, and as with all woods and veneers used by Rolls-Royce, it is sourced from sustainable forests.

Classic it may be, but the vehicle bristles with the latest technology. Beneath the front number plate is a discreet camera to provide a split-screen view of the road ahead, via the on-

board monitor, to assist parking or pulling out of a side road.

The "picnic" trunk has a bottom-hinged lid capable of holding a weight of 150 kilos and doubling as outdoor seating for adults, while the interior will accommodate at least three sets of golf clubs. Importantly, the trunk space remains intact whether the roof is raised or lowered.

The sumptuous leather front seats incorporate integral seatbelts and active headrests, while legroom in the rear is exemplary, making the Phantom Drophead a full four-seater. Open cars, of course, require different acoustic properties and in-car entertainment is delivered via nine channels and 15 speakers, creating a quality audio experience whether the roof is up or down.

The large wheels are equipped with run-flat Michelin tires enabling the car to tool on for up to 160 kilometers at speeds of 80 kph after a flat, despite its immense weight of 2,600kg.

To shift this mass, the power plant is the same one as the sedan: a powerful 6.75 liter V12 developing 453 bhp (338 kW) and 720 Nm of torque. Acceleration is a staggering six seconds from 0 to 100 kmh, while maximum speed is electronically limited to 240 kmh.

The brakes are equally impressive, with ventilated discs all round, utilizing twin-pot calipers on the front, single-pot at the rear. At rest an electro-mechanical parking brake can be applied at the push of a button on the dash. Emergency brake assist steps in under heavy braking, immediately applying full force in conjunction with the ABS in any emergency.

Clearly, North America will be the largest market for the new Phantom Drophead and it is unlikely to be spotted much in Asia. But if you ever get a chance, take a look at this beauty.

t is normal for a man like myself to take time to relax at good spas, but it's not easy finding a private spa that caters to my special needs.

However, I have finally found one – Hiranyikara is a spa, as they say, "with men in mind". It is located in a quiet area on the right side of the road to Bang Wad Reservoir in Kathu.

Although I am in a rush to try it when I learn that this spa targets men, I am a little shy to go there alone. So I convince a friend of mine, a girl who is more familiar with spas, to accompany me.

Spa consultant Jongrak "Pom" Khemsri welcomes us to the spa and hands us refreshing fresh ginger drinks. K. Pom explains that *hiranyikara* is the

Thai name for the Nepal trumpet flower, also called Herald's trumpet. In Thai, the flower's name conveys a sense of being soft yet strong.

strong.

"Our spa focuses on serving gay men. We had our grand opening on November 23, and we have had a surprisingly good response," K. Pom says. "We have about 20 customers a day, comprising tourists, Phuket expats and residents. About 70% of our guests

are foreigners. We also welcome straight men and women, too," says K. Pom.

The spa has nine therapists: seven men and two women, all of whom serve both male and female guests.

The spa menu includes not only the usual massages and facials, but also signature treatment packages such as Just for Men and Experience Hiranyikara, as

well as hair treatment and waxing. Prices range from 500 baht for a manicure or pedicure to 5,500 baht for the three-hour Experience Hiranyikara package.

K. Pom explains that Hiranyikara uses organic, non-allergenic spa products by Académie and Algotherm.

"One of our most popular

signature treatments is the Aroma Hiranyikara Massage. It's an oil massage that combines Thai massage and sport massage to help soothe muscle aches and pains," he says.

My friend seems to be anxious to try this treatment, but I still want something special for men that I would not find elsewhere, so K. Pom suggests I try a treatment from the Just for Men range, such as an Exfoli-

ation Back Massage.

He says that this treatment helps to remove dead skin from my back and helps to accelerate the natural skin-renewal process. I agree that it could be good for me since I usually don't have the time to scrub my back myself.

The spa area is decorated in modern tropical Thai style, mainly in purple and black. There is a Thai massage room with four

beds, which can be partitioned off by curtains; three VIP treatment rooms; a shower room; an oil massage room with fours beds; and a foot massage room with three beds.

Beside the swimming pool is a sauna with separate rooms for men and women, and a steam room that men and women can enjoy together. Guests can also enjoy a traditional Thai massage right by the pool.

"We think that many gay people don't know of a private place for spa treatment, so we are happy that our spa is now known for that and that they can relax in privacy," K. Pom says.

My friend meets her female therapist who will give her an Aroma Hiranyikara Massage, while I follow Jirakit "Ath" Samerpuean, my therapist, to a VIP room where there are two beds covered with white towels waiting for me. The room is a dark purple with warm lights that make me feel relaxed.

I am told to change into a small disposable G-string, which I feel is too tight for me. So I ask K. Ath if I can be naked under the towels. I am so happy to hear him shyly reply, "Yes."

I lay on my stomach while K. Ath prepares the body scrub cream, which is a blend of Ling Zhi and shiitake mushrooms with sweet almond oil, vitamin E and mint essential oil. I smell it, eager to know what K. Ath will do with me next.

He removes the towel and

applies the scrub to my back. He starts scrubbing my left shoulder, then down the left side of my back to my loin and buttocks. He scrubs again on other side with sweet movements. I feel relaxed and sleepy.

K. Ath finishes scrubbing, which takes about 20 minutes, and removes the cream with a wet towel. My back feels very clean

After the massage, I take a shower in the adjoining open-roof bathroom, which has bamboo wall. I can see the view outside, but I just hope that no one can see me from out there.

After my shower, I dress and wait beside the pool for my friend. I am served with a hot ginger drink and fresh watermelon and pineapple. About 10 minutes later, my friend arrives and sits beside me.

She asks me about my treatment. I can only reply, "Hmm...
I'll be back, but next time alone."







Just an ordinary executioner

here should be more books like this: the tale of an ordinary Thai man transcribed into English. Chavoret Jaruboon tells his life story to Nicola Pierce who, alas, does not appear to be a professional writer.

She begins far too many sentences with such unnecessary words as "fortunately", "unfortunately", "sadly", "happily". She is unaware that sentences do not start with numerals or that numerals under 10 are written out.

She misspells plenty of place names such as "Pattanee" and "Sattaheep". Also prisoners may have started a "ruckus" but not a "raucous".

But no matter, Chavoret's voice comes out loud and clear.

The son of a revered schoolteacher in Nonthaburi, he was not much of a student and took up a roving life as an Elvis Presley-style guitar player in various rock bands, touring American bases in Thailand during the Vietnam war.

Then he settled down in Nonthaburi with a wife and child and found steady work as a prison guard in Bang Kwang Central Prison. He rose to become executioner and shot 55 felons before the death penalty was changed to lethal injection.

This is the reason for the book's title: The Last Executioner (Maverick Press, Bangkok, 2006, 296pp), subtitled *Memoirs* of Thailand's Last Prison Executioner. Maverick Press has a penchant for jailhouse books: Welcome to Hell and You'll Never Walk Alone are two of its titles.




Chavoret's early years as a rock musician are just as fascinating as his macabre later ones.

"I had great fun with the Americans," he writes. "They taught me how to curse with expressions like 'F—you' and 'Go to hell, goddamit'. It was probably different for us, a band from Bangkok.

"Everyone else – bar owners, girls and taxi drivers – just saw walking dollar signs, whereas we got a chance to befriend them. We had our own money and didn't need anything from them. Instead, we would buy them dinner and just hang out – drinking and dancing to the latest hits on the jukebox."

In Bang Kwang, he begins assisting at executions as a way of furthering his

He relates some horrific tales, such as the rape and murder of a Thammasat librarian by two hardened criminals, be-



fore the eyes of her boyfriend who was then also murdered.

"They were pure evil," he writes. "I believe there are truly bad people who can never be cured of their desire to do depraved things. I don't think prison will make them any better than they are, and yes, I believe this type of person deserves to die."

Chavoret meticulously describes the procedures for capital punishment, leading up to the tying of the convicted to a cross and the burst from a stabilized submachine gun, mounted so that it looks like a sewing machine.

He does not enjoy his job but he is unapologetic: "An eye for an eye - personally, I think that's the way it should be. There are some people who will never see the error of their ways; who would not benefit from years in prison, they would go back out into the world and kill again.

"The death penalty is not the perfect solution, but I cannot think of a perfect alternative. Some people are just evil to

He describes the various social strata in the prison: the assistants or trustees who help the guards manage daily life, the hardcore criminals, the luckless accomplices, the death row inmates, the foreigner drug runners, the ladyboys.

The highlight of the book is a long, vivid description of the 1985 prison riot, showing just how tenuous control over thousands of prisoners can be.

Ironically, Chavoret was well-liked by the prisoners.

"I have come to believe that you have to respect the criminals and be a little bit curious about how they arrived in Bang Kwang. It makes the job more bearable and adds to my job satisfaction. If you respect the criminal as an equal human being, it pushes you to do your best and motivates you to make improvements."

After his career as executioner ended, Chavoret entered the monkhood to make merit. But while he was on the job, his devout Buddhism was no impediment to what he saw as necessary work.

Paying the price of collusion

There is an old adage that a successful business comes down to three key factors: location, location and location. The concept is certainly well understood by all sides in the recent protest at Phuket International Airport (PIA), where the installation of a new ticket sales counter not more than 50 meters from the old one sparked an immediate protest [see Inside Story, pages 4 and 5].

Arriving for work at the airport early that morning, members of the Phuket Limousine and Business Services Cooperative (PBC) quickly sprang into action, blocking off the entrance to the airport parking lot and erecting banners calling for the Airport Director to

It looks like the PBC may have won this most recent skirmish, but it might be losing the war. Recent years have seen the introduction of meter taxis and an Airport Bus service at the airport.

There is no doubt, however, as to who the big losers were in the latest strike: the thousands of tourists who arrived for the first day of their vacation only to find themselves in the middle of a blockade.

The Tourism Authority of Thailand last December lauded Thailand being named "best country brand for value for money" in a worldwide poll. Thailand does offer good value for money, but this only holds true in segments of the economy where free-market forces are allowed to prevail.

The public transport sector in Phuket is not one of them.

Nowhere is the effect more apparent than in places like Patong, where tuk-tuk drivers collude to enforce the highest per-kilometer fares for transport anywhere in Thailand.

They also have the nerve to protest and threaten further price hikes when the government takes steps to introduce a one-way road system to bring some order to the traffic chaos that the tuk-tuk drivers were largely responsible for creating in the first place.

To be free of the shackles of the transport syndicates what Phuket's tourism economy needs more than anything else is a muchimproved public transport system: not just for Phuket City and parts of the island where the population is mostly Thai, but also along the west coast tourist towns.

A good start would be a second Airport Bus service to Patong and Kata-Karon and another bus or passenger pick-up running between those two municipalities.

As we have seen from recent events, however, winning back the roads from vested interests will not be easy - especially when government-run agencies such as Airports of Thailand are reaping huge profits from existing arrangements. - The Editor

The investment climate in Phuket remains strong and I am often approached by foreign investors who want to consult with me over a wide range of projects, including property developments, marinas and megaprojects, such as an elevated railway system, a sports complex and MICE (Meeting Incentive Convention Exhibition)

However, some foreign investors I have talked to have asked for a change in the law to allow leases of up to 90 years, instead of just 30, so they can

As for changes to the proposed International Convention and Exhibition Center (ICEC) project under the new government, Tourism and Sports Minister Dr Suwit Yodmanee has ordered the Tourism Authority of Thailand Southern Region 4 Office in Phuket to review the details of the existing 1.8-billion-baht plan.

The TAT had already decided to site the ICEC at Saphan Hin, but a subsequent public hear-

ing on the issue was perhaps a bit too open. This resulted in a wide variety of alternative locations being proposed for the center, including Koh Maphrao and other places.

The result was that a consensus couldn't be reached. For this reason, I think next time we should have a tighter format, perhaps by using a "yes" or "no" referendum for where the ICEC should be sited.

I think Saphan Hin is a good location because the area is the traditional recreational and meet-

ing place of Phuket and offers a sea view. However, the condition of the sea there is degraded.

The ICEC could help spur redevelopment along Phuket City's waterfront and improve the area. Other advantages of the area include its proximity to many government offices in the area. An ICEC would make it easy to coordinate meetings on traffic and other issues requiring government involvement.

We will have another meeting about the ICEC soon and I think we will be able to clarify


many issues relating to it.

As for reports of an outbreak of Legionella in Phuket, I continue to push the Phuket Public Health Office for test results [which were still not available as this edition went to press] and we are working together with the World Health Organization.

Researchers have collected water samples and conducted thorough checks at the suspect locations, and we have developed two plans for how to proceed so that we will be ready regardless of whether the test results turn out to be negative or positive.

I have also set a policy for hotel operators to undertake continual monitoring and maintenance of their guest facilities, not just to maximize profits by having many tourists stay at their hotels but also by conforming to European Union health standards.

If the test results prove that the suspect patients did not contract the disease in Phuket, we will need to have a public relations campaign to publicize this message as soon as possible.

The last time I got one, the doctor asked me to breathe in once while he pretended to listen for signs of respiratory distress. That was it. I seriously wonder what sort of medical state – advanced leprosy perhaps? – one would have to be in to be denied one of these.

That was the entire medical evaluation necessary to be medically qualified to, in this instance, apply for a driver's license

Speaking of driving, there is a mechanical equivalent of the bai raprowng phaet. This is known as the truad saphab rot ekachon, or TorRorOr, vehicle inspection certificate.

All motorbikes over five years old require an inspection. If the vehicle passes muster, a certificate is granted allowing one to continue driving it. But when I took my old Honda Dream in to get one recently they didn't do

anything in terms of actually inspecting it, at least as far as I could tell. They didn't move the bike or even start it up.

It would appear that just as the ability to walk into a medical clinic qualifies one as "physically fit", the fact that a vehicle can be driven to a garage qualifies it as "mechanically sound".

I guess the quack doctors and grease monkeys who issue these certificates gain financially in doing so – and I am sure documents they produce give the bureaucrats more papers to stamp, shuffle and store.

But it is all a big waste of time and effort to the millions of people who have to go through this useless process, which must be costing the country millions in lost productivity every year. In my opinion they should do it right, or not do it at all.

Dear Wondering,

The word *boraan* originally did indeed mean something relatively old, such as stone/brick temples from the Sukothai period (12th-14th centuries) or even those from the Ayudhaya period (15th-18th centuries).

However, languages are al-I often get confused about ways changing, and boraan has become very much a part of modern urban slang; it now is often used to mean "old fashioned" or "not up-to-date". These newer usages have an ironic sense of exaggeration, rather than the tra-

> ditional meaning of "ancient". For example, we can say that a person is boraan, hua which means an old-fashioned or traditional type.

> Even in English, the word "ancient" can be used in an ironic sense to mean an old person or thing.

> The use of such a word in Thai or English (boraan or "ancient") in refer-

ence to history is, of course, very relative. As far as historical sites go (Egyptian or Thai or whatever), it often simply depends upon when a particular culture began to build (usually religious or civic structures) in brick or stone.

In other words, something from the past which we can still see today becomes boraan or "ancient" just by virtue of its relative age in comparison to the buildings near it, and its continued existence in our prefab, disposable, amnesiac age.





To speed up your Internet connection you must dump your cache; it's slowing down your computer. You can do this right now by clicking your "Tools" button on your browser, then selecting "Internet Options".

You can then remove your "Temporary Internet Files", and "Cookies" and "History" too, if you like. This will free up the blockage and allow your computer to run faster.

Forgive me for repeating your comment verbatim, WM,

but I've heard this advice from several people on the island lately.

months ago, I read essentially the same advice in one of the big Bangkok English-language newspapers.

Although you mean well, there's just one problem. The tip is completely, totally, utterly incorrect. It's an electronic urban leg-

Every computer contains many caches. Cache is computer lingo for "something that you leave sitting around somewhere to speed things up." So, for ex-

Flush with cache

ample, your hard drive has a cache - data on the hard drive (which takes a long time to access) gets shuffled to and from memory chips inside the drive (which are fast) to speed up access to the data.

A cache is very similar to a buffer, if you've ever bumped into that term.


The primary difference is one of intent: a buffer exists to hold a large chunk of data, so it can be broken down into smaller chunks. A cache exists to speed

up access to data. Frequently, the two functions overlap: one man's cache is

another man's buffer, and vice-

Every moderately sentient Web browser maintains a cache. When you surf to a Web page, the browser looks inside your computer to see if you've already retrieved that particular page. If you have, the browser can retrieve the page from your computer's memory, which is a heck of a lot faster than downloading it again from the Internet.

Of course, the browser has

to be able to figure out if the copy of the page that's inside your computer is the same as the copy that's currently available on the

The precise method for deciding whether a cached page has gone stale is rather complicated, and varies from browser to

To confuse things a little bit. most Internet Service Providers also maintain caches of frequently-accessed Web pages. That causes all sorts of problems for people who make changes to their Web pages. But I digress.

Internet Explorer stores its cached Web pages in the "Temporary Internet Files" folder. If you delete your Temporary Internet Files in IE, you slow down your Internet access. Why? Because IE can't use already-fetched pages - you deleted its cache, so it has no choice but to go out to the Internet to retrieve a fresh copy of every page you request.

That isn't a huge time waster because IE immediately starts caching every new page it gathers. But it does slow things down a bit until the cache gets built back up.

There are three good reasons for clearing your browser's cache:

• You've run out of space on your hard drive. IE's Temporary Internet Files folder gobbles up space like Garfield stuffs lasagna. (I give several hints for taming IE's voracious appetite in Windows XP Timesaving Techniques For Dummies and in Windows Vista Timesaving Tech*niques For Dummies.*)

• You want to erase all memory of where you've been. If that's your aim, make sure the deleted files don't end up in the Recycle Bin.

• You have reason to believe that Internet Explorer's cache is all screwed up. I've never seen this happen, but apparently in rare circumstances IE can start dishing up old Web pages, and the only way to correct the problem is to flush the cache.

Having said that, I would be derelict in my duties if I didn't point out one important fact. You shouldn't be using IE 6. It is so full of security holes that Microsoft posts a major collection of patches for it every month.

Every Windows user should upgrade to Internet Explorer 7 (www.microsoft.com/windows/ ie), specifically because it closes many of the IE 6 security holes. Even IE 7, in its short life, has sprouted several security holes

You may need to upgrade to IE 7 even if you don't use Internet Explorer, because Microsoft's other programs specifically Outlook, Outlook Express, and Windows Mail – use IE behind the scenes, and security holes in IE 6 poke through to


If you don't already have an alternative Web browser of choice, run, don't walk, to your computer, download and install Firefox (www.getfirefox.com). Now. Seriously. It may take a while to download Firefox, but it's considerably more secure than IE. And it's free.


Note that Firefox and IE happily coexist, side-by-side. Firefox doesn't step on IE's toes. IE doesn't even know that Firefox exists. And if you want to flush Firefox's cache, by all means, go right ahead. Just don't expect it to speed up, OK?

The US currently spends around 8.5% of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) on these programs. It is expected that by 2030 this will


by promising not to raise taxes despite the urging of some of her radical colleagues.

On the center-right is Interior Minister Nicholas Sarkozy, who is proposing to reduce taxes

for the highest income earners from 60% to *only* 50%. In other words, for high wage earners who cannot escape taxes, the government will move from being the senior partner in their pay to being an equal partner.

One would expect that most owners of successful small businesses in France are masters in the art of tax evasion. Under these circumstances, who could blame them?



Luna Phuket shines on

ork on phase one of the luxury modern villa development Luna Phuket, located near Laguna Phuket, is 30% complete. Phase one of the project comprises 10 villas on 4.5 rai. Phase two will be 11 villas on five rai

The project, originally started by the late John Seebach, has been taken over by Paul Moorhouse, who has been involved in the creation of Layan Gardens, Lakeshore Villas, Lakewood Hills and Plaza Del Mar, as well the Orchard Springs development, on which work began just last month.

"John just started to build the first five houses, and then unfortunately he passed away very suddenly and his wife asked me to help her to find a buyer for the project. I went to have a look at it and I liked it very much, so I put together a deal to buy and develop it," said Mr Moorhouse.

Three of the first five villas being built were sold in October last year. One of them is now complete and will become the show home. The remaining five villas of phase one will be built only after the completion of the first five.

All 10 villas in phase one are expected to be completed by December this year, while work on the phase two homes will start in May with a scheduled deadline of August 2008.

The 355-square-meter villas are in contemporary style, each

with three bedrooms with en-suite bathrooms.

All villas will be on plots ranging from 500sqm to 700sqm, each with a courtyard area, private pool, parking space for two cars and a barbecue in the garden area. Prices range from 16.5 million baht to 19 million baht per unit.

"This development is quite different from anything else that is being built in this area. Almost all [homes] around here are in modern southern Thai style, but [Luna Phuket homes] are very modern and very practical.

"The flow inside is very nice, and they're very light and spacious," Mr Moorhouse said.

After the first phase is completed, the development's facilities will be built, including tennis courts, a clubhouse, a bar and a small restaurant.

In the meantime, residents can use the facilities at Layan Gardens – half a kilometer away – where there is a swimming pool with pool bar, a barbecue area, tennis courts, a gymnasium and a putting green.

"The main difference of Luna Phuket from other developments is the design. Everything is all on one level. The houses have been designed to be very light, very clean and they have a very good functional design," Mr Moorhouse said.

The villas are designed by Singapore-based HD Design Co Ltd, which also designed The Heights at Surin Beach.

The project is attracting buyers from throughout east Asia, particularly people who live and work in Singapore, Hong Kong, Shanghai and Tokyo.

"Some of our buyers are expats who are married to Thais, but now we are getting many inquiries from Europe," Mr Moorhouse said, adding that the response through online marketing has been particularly good.

"The reaction – from Europeans, in particular – is that they like the ease with which it will work, it's not fussy. But the most important aspect is the price, it's very reasonable.

"Nowhere in this area has detached homes with three bedrooms, three bathrooms and a 50-sqm swimming pool for 16.5 million baht. We can make quality houses with unique designs for that," Mr Moorhouse said.

or people who want to store their monitors, stereos and MP3 players practically and tastefully, there is a growing range of modern furniture to choose from.

Furniture compatible with multimedia components is the industry's latest trend, according to Ursula Geismann, spokeswoman for the Union of the German Furniture Industry in Bad Honnef.

The new furniture aims to appeal first and foremost to men. "Ît's also about the man who wants to appreciate optimum sound from his Dolby surroundsound speakers while sitting in a comfortable upholstered furniture," said Geismann.

Another goal is making the TV screen presentable at all times. That can mean taking advantage of countless furniture systems to showcase the device and its accessories or investing in attractive sideboards and containers to hide it when not in use.

In reality, many manufacturers do not offer custom-made pieces. Usually they offer lines to mix and match and suit the style of an apartment. One example is the Menos line from Behr International in Osnabrück.

"To integrate televisions and hi-fi devices, you blend special media units into the basic set. These come with spaces for cables," says Menos owner Dieter Neumann.

The units are available in a large range of colors. The furniture includes recessed, fold-out aluminum grips as well as individual, stackable "crates" in matte or highly glossed varnishes. Colors range from shiny to subdued, sand to espresso.

The Cubus solid wood system from Team 7, based in Ried, Austria, also features streamlining. It offers individual shelving units that can be combined, some with swinging glass doors that can



remember England, I think. The image is a little bit hazy now, but there's probably no coincidence that "hazy" describes British weather perfectly. It's grim. It seems that every day the weather system produces some variation of overcast.

Sorry, I'm exaggerating – I believe the sun did actually make a guest appearance there in 1996.

Desperation for weather that even hints at being pleasant is probably why the subject dominates conversation in the UK:

"It's turned out nice again."
(It's less overcast than yester-day)

"Do you think it will rain lat-

"Probably, but it may brighten up after." (Desperation creeps in.)

"Not so cold today, though." (It hasn't risen above freezing for weeks.)

"No, it's quite mild." Etc.

I'm absolutely serious; these conversations are the norm, and can sometimes go on for hours. There are only so many ways you can comment on weather that's cold, wet and miserable.

An ex-colleague of mine, British, not surprisingly, combined his predictable British pessimism

with a daily comment on the weather. Bathed in glorious Thai sunshine as we climbed into the tuk-tuk on the way to work, he would deliver his daily weather observation: "At least it's not ****ing raining". On the occasional damper days, his first line as he folded his umbrella was equally expected: "It's ****ing raining again". He was from Middlesborough, if that explains anything.

A British barbecue is something to behold. It's planned like a military operation, with a backup procedure in place to rescue the chicken legs and sausages as soon as the first drops of rain are detected. Everyone knows what to do. It hasn't occurred to British garden planners to build some kind of covered area; having said that I'm not sure I would particularly want to be in the back garden during a British downpour. England is a country where you put your beer in the fridge to warm it up.

That's where Thailand has

got it right. It sometimes rains here, but it really doesn't matter, as you're already probably under some sort of cover and you're hardly likely to freeze to death. Even your beer is probably already in the garden in one of those ice-filled chests that people borrow from fish sellers.

It's all rather civilized. So how do you plan the garden in which you'll be spending so many of your leisure hours? Gardens and outdoor living areas are often things that are just thrown together. We often think it does the job if it's reasonably pleasant-looking, but why not make it functional as well as aesthetically pleasing?

It might as well be designed to fit the needs of a family or whoever is likely to be using it. Whether it's for football and French cricket for the kids, or for the more 'passive' type of recreational activities that most adults tend to enjoy, everyone should be able to make the most of the outdoor environment.

Patios are the obvious things to kick off with. Fundamentally, they should be big enough to be useful. What's the point of a few uninviting paving stones chucked on the ground behind the house? Make it big enough to do what you want to do on it, or don't

bother. Table football or table tennis? Cooking area or spare dining area?

Tiny patios just look a bit silly. On the other hand, patios can be so huge that they take on the coldness of the Tesco-Lotus carpark. Ideally, the size of your patio should be in scale with the size of your garden and house.

It may seem a bit obvious, but don't forget to leave plenty of space to plant stuff. Wall-to-wall concrete certainly gives you more area to host parties for 50, but this is Phuket, so you might as well make the most of the natural beauty. It doesn't necessarily have to be exposed soil – potted plants will do the job equally well, and you can even move them around if you get bored.

Elsewhere in the garden, it's worth considering where to create flower beds and features, too. Attempting a sedate game of croquet isn't ideal while attempting to dodge rockeries and ponds. Do you really want to set up your kids' trampoline over your ixoras? Sounds quite painful, come to think of it.

Trees are always good as a source of natural shade. Even better, put them near the house to provide shade for the house itself, as well as the outdoors area. You can even group trees togeth-

er if you can't be bothered with all that growing and maturing business. Avoid trees with big fruit – unless you plan to eat the product – or anything that has flowers or seeds that will mean constant cleaning up after it.

Smaller plants are another important factor in outdoor living areas. Interesting stuff with a variety of looks and shapes will liven up the view as you munch on your freshly-cooked burger. Plenty of different colors, forms and textures are desirable; not just flowers, but different foliage too.

Masses of flowering annuals in the patio area are dead easy to get going, and given the huge choice of annuals here in Phuket, we really have no excuse not to make it spectacular.

One thing to bear in mind when choosing plants: make sure that the spot you have in mind for the plant back home in your garden is similar to where you found it in the local garden center.


Open to the sun, or in the shade? Directly under a sprinkler, or in a far corner? Close to the ground or cascading from a shelf or basket?


That's what I like about gardening in this country – there's always someone around who really knows what they're doing, and you don't even need to ask. Just copy him. Or her.

But don't go mad and try to fill every last square inch straight away. Bear in mind the rate at which everything grows here. A mish-mash of entangled, confused greenery six months down the line isn't exactly ideal.

Outdoor living areas don't need to be a giant expanse of cement. When trudging round the garden centers to resolve this, then eventually up to your elbows in muck planting your purchases, console yourself with the fact that you could be doing this in deepest, darkest England, or anywhere else cold, wet and miserable. At least it's not ***ing raining. Actually, I really don't care if it is. Hand me a trowel and a beer, please.


