Foreign teacher checks continue

PHUKET: Foreign teachers will continue to be the target of Immigration crackdowns, Thai Immigration Chief Pol Lt Gen Suwat Tumrongsiskul confirmed during a recent visit to Phuket. His agency, in co-operation with the Ministry of Education (MoE), will continue to conduct strict background checks on all foreigners applying for teaching jobs in the Kingdom.

Gen Suwat said Immigration agreed with the MoE that such a crackdown was necessary to prevent crime and to protect students from unqualified foreign teachers and those with deviant sexual behavior that could put children at risk.

Gen Suwat, in Phuket to attend a ceremony to lay the foundation stone for the new Phuket Immigration Office, confirmed that the new measures stemmed from the deportation last year of American John Mark Karr, a former suspect in the 1996 murder of six-year-old JonBenét Ramsey in Colorado who was found teaching in Bangkok last year.

Gen Suwat told reporters said that random checks of 1,000 foreign teachers had turned up 65 whose academic credentials had been forged.

"This convinced us of the need to be more strict in checking teachers' qualifications. We don't want unqualified teachers or sexual deviants teaching Thai children. This crackdown will help us to better screen the backgrounds of people coming here to teach," he said.

Gen Suwat admitted that it is difficult to ascertain a person's sexual proclivities though such

checks, but said that police could gain valuable information about applicants by checking to see if they had criminal records back in their home countries.

On October 1, Immigration began enforcing a measure limiting to 90 days [over any 180-day period] the length of stay of tourists entering the country on successive "visas-on-arrival". When asked if the new regulation had caused confusion and delays at Immigration checkpoints, Gen Suwat said the counting process was "no problem" for his officers, who could use a computer to help them add up the days.

He defended the new measure by saying it had little impact on legitimate long-stay tourists but was an effective way to prevent foreigners from using the free visas to stay in the country

and work illegally. "The 30-day tourist visa allows enough time for a tourist to travel around the country. If people want to work here, they should apply for a [non-immigrant] visa from the Thai embassy or consulate in their home country before coming here," he said.

When asked about the interception of several vessels carrying Burmese nationals in Thai territorial waters in recent months, Gen Suwat said the passengers were poor people only passing through Thailand on their way to find work in Malaysia.

Nevertheless, they needed to be deported as a security risk, he said.

A bigger concern is posed by foreign criminals and money launderers who come to Thailand to escape criminal prosecution in their own countries, he said.

Suspects cleared of goldshop heist

PHUKET CITY: Two suspects in last month's armed robbery on a Chao Fa East Rd gold shop have been cleared by police after they turned themselves in to the authorities to proclaim their innocence.

Sketches of the two men had been released by the police because they had visited the gold shop earlier in the week.

Pol Maj Sompong Boonrat, Deputy Inspector at Phuket City Police Station, said that police have checked the two men's alibis and found them to be watertight.

"The people in the sketches we released are the wrong people. We have investigated where they were at the time of the robbery and they could not have done it; they are innocent," Maj Sompong said.

The artists impressions of the two men wanted in connection with the January 27 robbery of Thongroj gold shop in Dowroong Villa were released January 30.

A 300,000 baht reward was also offered for information leading to the arrest of the armed robber, who made off with gold jewelry worth more than a million baht in the heist.

"We have warned all gold shops in Phuket and in major cities in the South to be on the lookout for any gold they suspect may be stolen. We have also set up checkpoints to catch the robber if he is still in Phuket," Maj Sompong said.

"We think that he is not from this area, and he may well be from Patthalung or Nakorn Sri Thammarat," Maj Sompong added, without specifying what led police to this conclusion.

Reinforcements still on hold

PHUKET: The 150 police officers from the Deep South have yet to arrive, despite Royal Thai Police Headquarters in Bangkok having approved the request, Provincial Police Commander Pol Maj Gen Decha Budnampetch has told the *Gazette*.

"It will not be a permanent move, just a temporary measure to assist us as Phuket is always short of police," he explained.

"I think the arrangement will be good for both of us... it will give Region 9 officers a chance to relax from the stressful situation in Yala, Pattani and Narathiwat," he added.

Ao Phuket project survey completed

PHUKET CITY: Public opinions of the 70-billion-baht convention center and hotel project proposed to be built on reclaimed land off Saphan Hin have been surveyed, but the results have yet to be analyzed, researchers Dr Aree Tirasatayapitak and assistant Kamontorn Prompitak have reported.

Opinions were gathered from 600 people in Phuket, 300 each in Phang Nga and Krabi provinces, as well as from a public hearing.

The results will be released "within a couple of months", Dr Aree said.

Heartthrob shot dead

PHUKET CITY: Sombat Aremsamkok, 25, a popular DJ renowned for his good looks, died after being shot in the heart at point blank range January 26.

K. Sombat was shot in the back at Takhrai restaurant, where he worked as a DJ, in Phun Pol Night Plaza.

The bullet passed through his heart and exited from the left side of his chest. He died on the way to hospital.

Two dark-skinned, Southern-Thai-looking men with long hair are wanted for the shooting.

New District Chief tackles Thalang traffic

THALANG: Newly-appointed Thalang District Chief Samart Waradisai plans to request a budget to build a tunnel and more dedicated U-turns in order to improve traffic flow and safety on Thepkrasattri Rd.

Thalang District Office, working with the Phuket Provincial Highway Office (PPHO) and Thalang Police, has already taken steps to improve traffic flow at Heroines' Monument.

During peak hours, from 7 am to 9 am and from 5 pm to 7 pm, vehicles arriving at the circle from the west and wanting to con-

tinue east or south now must first turn left and drive north about 600 meters before making a U-turn.

Vehicles arriving at the circle from the east and wanting to continue west or north must first turn left (south) and make a U-turn near Wat Koh Kaew.

Both U-turn areas are marked with traffic cones, allowing the turns to be made without having to stop for oncoming traffic. The changes allow north- and south-bound traffic to continue unhindered through the circle and reduce gridlock during peak periods.

A similar system is also in place near Baan Kian market in Tambon Thepkrasattri.

The change in traffic flow forces people to drive further, but increases safety and saves time and fuel, K. Samart said.

K. Samart also wants to introduce a controlled U-turn in front of Thalang Hospital.

"I have heard that at least 10 people have been killed while trying to make a Uturn there. It is very dangerous because of the curve; drivers cannot see oncoming vehicles there," he said.

Long-term planning for this area should include a tunnel and U-turn points similar to those in Bangkok, K. Samart added.

A proposal seeking funding for these projects will be submitted, he said.

Eight disaster-alert stations plundered

PHUKET CITY: Thieves have stolen copper cable from lightning rods at eight of the island's 11 emergency radio network repeater stations, forcing the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) to spend some 2.7 million baht on repairs.

News of the vandalism was reported by *OrBorJor* Vice-President Suthin Uthaithamrong at the January 30 meeting of provincial office chiefs.

To steal the copper, thieves broke into padlocked enclosures around eight towers, all in remote, high-elevation locations, K. Suthin explained.

Sites at Laem Phromthep, Sapam, Tah Chat Chai, Nai Thon, in front of Veerastree Anusorn School in Thalang, in front of Kamala Police Station and two sites in the Nakkerd Hills were hit.

The lightning rods are used to protect repeater stations of the *OrBorJor*'s emergency radio network.

They were built after the tsunami at a cost of more than 8 million baht to allow communica-

tion in the event of another disaster that would cause mobile phone networks to fail.

The network is the brain-child of *OrBorJor* President Anchalee Vanich-Thepabutr, who after the tsunami found herself unable to co-ordinate emergency response efforts because the mobile phone system she used was jammed.

The repeater stations allows users, including members of the *OrBorJor* beach guard and the

Tourist Rescue Center in Chalong, to communicate by walkietalkie.

The network's base station is near the site of the Mingmong-kol Buddha statue being built in the Nakkerd Hills, K. Suthin said.

The network covers the entire island and emits signals that can be picked up as far away as parts of Krabi, he added.

The thefts did not disable the repeater stations, but hindered their effectiveness during electri-

cal storms and left them vulnerable to lightning strikes, he said.

The damages have been repaired at all locations, at a cost of about 50,000 baht each, out of the *OrBorJor*'s emergency fund.

The first thefts were reported in mid-2006, with three thefts – in Kamala, Sapam and the Nakkerd Hills – carried out over the New Year holidays.

Padlocked enclosures with chain-link fencing 2.5-meters tall did not deter the thieves, who left behind some of the cutting equipment they used at some sites, he said.

K. Suthin blamed secondhand shops that deal in stolen goods for creating a market for thieves. Copper of the same quality as that stolen could fetch up to 1,000 baht a kilo, he said.

In response to K. Suthin's report, Vice-Governor Vorapoj Rattasima, who chaired the meeting in place of Governor Niran Kalayanimit, instructed Phuket's three District Chiefs to crack down on secondhand shops that receive stolen goods.

Bantoon Thongtan, Head of the Phuket Attorney's Office, told the meeting that he will recommend prison terms, not just fines, in cases of theft of government property – especially in cases where public safety is jeopardized





Surayud, Badawi to play a round in Phuket

PHUKET: Prime Minister Gen Surayud Chulanont and Malaysian Prime Minister Abdullah bin Haji Ahmad Badawi are scheduled to meet in Phuket on February 11 to play a round of golf and stay one night, before heading to Bangkok the following day.

The stately visit was announced by Phuket Vice-Governor Tri Augkaradacha at a meeting on February 5 at Phuket Provincial Hall.

Citing a draft itinerary, V/ Gov Tri said that PM Badawi is scheduled to arrive in Phuket around 11 am, just after Gen Surayud's flight is scheduled to

The Prime Ministers will

play golf in the afternoon, then dine together in the evening.

The venues the PMs will visit have yet to be confirmed, though more details are expected to be released tomorrow.

In the afternoon of February 12, PM Badawi and Gen Surayud will leave Phuket for Bangkok on different planes. Both will arrive Bangkok around

At 5:40 pm that day both Prime Ministers will attend meetings at Government House, and at 7:20 pm they are expected to make an announcement together. More details were not available.

PM Badawi will leave Bangkok February 13, although a departure time has yet to be

Phuket investors implicated in human trafficking bust

MAE HONG SON (*The Nation*): Twenty long-neck Karen (Paduang) women arrested while crossing the Thai-Burmese border on January 31 allegedly were to be sold to a group of Phuket investors for 10 million baht, police said February 1.

Mae Hong Son Provincial Governor Direk Konkleeb urged officers to extend the investigation to arrest those behind the alleged human trafficking.

One of the women, identified only as "Som-O", told police that they had come from Doi Kor province's Ti Mo So District in Burma to stay with Karen residents in Mae Hong Son's Huai Pukaeng Village.

Som-O said that she had heard that the Karen at Ti Mo lived in harsh conditions, so she invited them to cross the border

with her to live in Thailand.

The woman appeared to be very stressed, so police placed her under close watch to prevent her from committing suicide.

Another Paduang told police that Som-O early last year had married a Bangkok businessman – although he was allegedly already married to a Thai woman – and had built a resort in Baan Huai Deu to support Som-O's

The woman added that the businessman wanted 20 Paduang from Ti Mo So sold to a group of Phuket investors for 10 million

The Paduang, currently being held for further questioning at Mae Hong Son's Muang District Police Station, would later be handed to Immigration police for deportation.

Glue-sniffing youths arrested over brutal stabbing, beating

PHUKET CITY: Phuket City Police have arrested five of nine suspects wanted for the savage murder of Keittirat Longnawa, a 31-year-old transsexual and glue addict who was beaten and had his throat slashed in Rassada on January 31.

Police announced the arrest of the five suspects at a February 5 press conference at Phuket City Police Station.

They are still searching for four more suspects in the case. All nine suspects, including two girls, ranged in age from 14 to 21, police said.

Phuket Police Station Superintendent Pol Col Nos Sawetalek told reporters that around 8 pm on January 31, a group of 10 youths gathered to sniff glue in a forested area about 100 meters off Soi Honsaitong in Rassada

While intoxicated, one of the teens, a 16-year-old, became incensed at K. Keittirat.

Taking a kitchen knife carried by one of the girls, he stabbed the transsexual, a native of Ao Luk District in Krabi.

Police said they could not confirm a report in the Thai-language press that the reason for the youngster's anger was that he was convinced that the ladyboy, a native of Krabi, had used witchcraft to put a spell on him that caused stomach pain.

Whatever the motive, after the teen attacked the victim the other teens all joined him in a frenzy, taking turns stabbing, kicking and hitting the victim with sticks, Col Nos said.

The initial assailant was one of the youths arrested.

K. Keittirat's bloody corpse was discovered the following afternoon by a villager, who informed police.

The victim was clad only in jeans, with a brassiere, address book, sandals and two bloodied bags containing glue nearby.

Police said the body was later identified by one of K. Keittirat's friends, who revealed that K. Keittirat had lived in Soi Mordoo ("Fortune teller Street"), also in Rassada.

All of the suspects were known to police as habitual glue users, although none had been convicted of a violent crime be-

The five arrested have been charged with conspiring to commit murder.

Thai youth: Clever, constructive... copulating

PHUKET: Phuket Provincial Health Office PPHO Chief Dr Wanchai Satthayawuthipong said that as Valentine's Day is a time of high risk for youths losing their virginity and contracting STDs, the PPHO will hold educational campaigns at schools throughout Phuket in the week leading up to the day of love.

Citing a 2005 survey of teens in Bangkok, the office reported that 29% of youths between 15 and 24 years old have had sex, while 7.5% intentionally have sex on Valentine's Day.

The study also found an increase in STDs such as gonorrhea among teenagers and called for more sexual education throughout the country.

The slogan this year is "Thai youth: Clever, constructive, and protecting against sexually contracted diseases and Aids".

Phuket 'bird flu free' -Livestock

PHUKET CITY: Phuket is free of H5N1 bird flu, says Phuket Provincial Livestock Office (PPLO) Chief Dr Sunart Wongvorachart.

Last month the PPLO began an inspection and sterilization program at 17 local poultry farms, where samples were collected and sent for laboratory analysis. Thus far, all results have been negative for the H5N1 virus that causes the disease, he said.

There are 500,000 chickens on the island, of which 300,000 are laving hens. As this is insufficient to meet demand, birds are imported to the island.

However, bird flu has never been a problem in Phuket, Dr Sunart said. "For chickens imported from outside Phuket, we have vet officers standing by 24 hours a day at Tah Chat Chai checkpoint.

We have maintained strict checks since January 2004, so we are confident that Phuket is free from bird flu."



Phuket's fight

s of November 2006, Phuket Province had the fourth highest per capita incidence of Aids in Thailand, and was ranked second among the southern provinces.

Eam-Orn Kittitornkul, Chief of the Aids/STDs Section of the Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO), said that 4,214 people have been found with HIV at Phuket's public hospitals – Vachira, Patong and Thalang – since 1989

Of those patients, 3,315 people have developed Aids: 2,300 males and 1,015 females. The year 2006 saw 233 new HIV cases, and by the end of that year 1,062 people had died of Aids in Phuket.

"Before, the main risk group for HIV in Phuket was 'bar girls'. Our public relations effort has involved teaching them how to protect themselves. We have mobile clinic teams that go out to take care of them.

"It's also a direct way to research their behavior to identify risks, such as by asking if they use condoms.

"Sometimes they incorrectly use condoms by coating them with a lotion or an inappropriate lubricating gel, which can make condoms leak," said K. Eam-Orn.

The mobile clinic team, started in November, goes out twice a month. The mobile clinic is set up to provide pelvic exams, voluntary counseling, STD/HIV testing and treatment, health education, and condom promotion, said K. Eam-Orn.

It has 64 regular patients, 56 of whom have had blood tests for HIV. Of these, three have been found HIV positive.

K. Eam-Orn went on to explain that the health office has set up an agreement with bar workers to provide free blood tests for HIV and other infections every three months.

The workers who take these tests will then be provided with a card that identifies their HIV status. The office also provides free condoms.

After the test results come back, someone from the health office meets with the patient and explains the outcome; if the test is positive for HIV they help treat the patient.

K. Eam-Orn said that she is not too concerned with the incidence of HIV in bar workers as she feels that her program is getting the problem under control through education and counseling. However, she has identified another section of the demographic where the outlook is more bleak.

"The problem group is teenagers and students. It's so hard to test because they move so fast in a very active sexual culture. There is also a lack of Aids in-

With a vibrant nightlife and constant turnover of people, Phuket suffers certain liabilities; health risks being by far the least of them. formation and awareness among teenagers

"The concern stems from our research, which has revealed that very few Phuket teenagers use condoms with their partners."

Perhaps most worrying is that fact that just one HIV-infected teen can spread the virus to

many others before his or her HIV-positive status is known.

" H I V sometimes doesn't show up in teenagers because the incubation period can take years. This is why the teenage group is not suffering at this time. But in the future, this group will certainly be a problem generation for Thailand... They have immoral behavior, wanting to compete over sex with their friends. It's so dangerous to think like that," she said.

The health office has made attempts to educate students about their sexual health and

HIV, but their suggestions have been turned down. with the PPHO and asked them to arrange seminars and condom

"We have met with schools about finding ways to help stop unsafe sex among students, but teachers don't accept that HIV is a problem. We want them to increase sex education classes, but some teachers think it's not proper to talk with students about this because they are young. But actually if we give them knowledge about it when they are young, those children will protect themselves."

Another idea was to set out "condom boxes" in schools so sexually-active students would at least have access to protection. But it also failed because teachers raised concern that it would be bad for Thai culture and would

encourage students to have sex.

"It's a difference in opinion because we think of the students' health and the teachers look at Thai students' image."

Apart from promiscuous teens, Thai society has at-large recognized the threat of HIV/ Aids and responded to it, she said.

"Overall, condom use among Thai people is better now than in the past. In our research, we found that about 97-98% of prostitutes use condoms during sex," she said.

Phukets Governor Niran Kalayanamit told the Gazette that the number of HIV patients in Phuket is increasing because it is a tourist destina-

"We have to make it more clear to the public to use protection [if we are] to reduce the number of patients, especially among teenagers," he said.

"We met with the PPHO and asked them to arrange seminars and condom distribution at schools, but some of the schools were against that idea," he added.

Patong Hospital Director Dr Thaweesak Netwong said that because of the social stigma attached with HIV infection, the actual numbers of infections could be higher than the official number.

He cited the lack of a system to integrate data from government hospitals with those from private-sector institutions as another obstacle to obtaining more comprehensive figures.

"Patong is one of the biggest tourist entertainment spots in Thailand, and of course directly and indirectly offers sexual ser-

vices, as most bar workers are involved organizations are helpwilling to do that. They have the opportunity for several partners each day.

"So this group is high-risk, which is why we are paying them the most attention. The number of this group is high also," he said.

Male sex workers have the highest rate of infection, more than double that of female sex workers, he added.

Patong Hospital, together with the Patong Health Office, is trying to make a physical checkup every two weeks and a blood test every three months mandatory for all bar staff and sex workers. Kathu Police and other

ing to implement the plan, he said.

"Bar girls are still a problem. All bar workers must register and provide a personal profile and health record. Whoever is in this business must be registered. If they aren't, we have to force them to do so.

"They have to take responsibility for their health in order to be responsible to society and help to prevent a social problem," he said.

Dr Thaweesak said that so far the entertainment businesses have been co-operating with the health office in having their staff take the blood tests. If these businesses cease such cooperation in the future, more drastic measures could be imposed.

This might include having the Governor issue an order revoking a venue's entertainment license if it fails to comply, he said.

"We have already been working on this for two months. In Patong, there are about 300 entertainment venues. Beer bars, go-go bars, massage parlors and discotheques are our main tar-

Icy-cool safe-cracker

becoming more brazen these days, to the point that one burglar stopped to enjoy an ice cream while trying to break into an ATM machine – and still got away scot free.

At 1:30 pm on February 4, the manager of an EZ-Video rental shop branch on Chao Fa East Rd called Phuket City Police to report a break-in at the shop, located in a double shophouse opposite the entrance to Suan Luang Park.

The manager, Yupha Nontri, 41, said that a person or persons unknown had broken into the shop, stolen money from the cash register, and tried to break into an ATM machine there.

Responding to the call were Phuket City Police Deputy Superintendent Lt Col Somphong Boonrat, Duty Inspector Lt Col Sien Kaewthong, of Phuket City Police Station, and other investigation officers.

K. Yupha told them that when she arrived with three other staffers to open the store as normal at 1 pm, they immediately noticed that the BankThai ATM machine inside the shop was unplugged and that its control panel had been forced open.

K. Yupha, who lives with other employees in staff accom-

> It had been forced open and the 6,000 baht left there the night before was missing. Also missing was 600 baht in cash from a box used to collect money from the sale of mobile phone top-up cards.

> A subsequent check of the crime scene indicated that the intruder had climbed onto the roof of a storeroom at the shop's rear, then removed some wall tiles to gain access.

> From the evidence at the scene, police believe the thief unplugged the ATM machine and then pried open its control panel.

> He was unable to gain entry to the ATM's safe, however, and after repeated attempts failed, he probably felt hot and tired.

> This was when he took an ice cream from the Wall's ice cream freezer next to the machine and ate it, likely pondering how to breach the safe.

> Unfortunately for him, the frozen confection did not help his efforts to crack the ATM safe. He eventually called it quits, disappearing with the cash he had managed to swipe.



he Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) office in Germany recently supported Khao Lak's comeback with nationwide media coverage informing travelers about the quick recovery of Khao Lak and its neighboring beaches.

One of Germany's most successful online newspapers, www.n-tv.de, with the headline "On offer again: Khao Lak" reported that shortly after the tsunami Khao Lak had become a household name due to the extensive media coverage of the large number of German travelers killed in the region.

In 2005, many leisure industry experts feared Khao Lak had been wiped from the tourism map. Yet Khao Lak made it back into the travel catalogs of Germany's leading tour operators in only two years, the report said.

In an understatement, TAT Germany representative Bettina Kraemer said to n-tv.de that there were about 40 hotels and bungalow resorts with about 4,000 beds available in Khao Lak in December 2004 (there were actually more than 5,000 beds waiting to accommodate visitors in 2004) and that the same number had almost been reached, although not all resorts had been rebuilt yet.

"The year 2005 was the cleanup year, 2006 was the reconstruction year and by January 2007 all resorts that are under construction will be ready," Ms Kraemer said late December.


Well, anyone who passes through Khao Lak with open eyes and ears knows that this is not exactly true. Construction is going on year round all over Khao Lak, and with huge reconstruction projects such as the Khaolak Laguna Resort being about half-complete it will be at least 12 to 18 months before Khao Lak is back to 2004 pre-tsunami status.

Khao Lak today is as it was in 2003. Sedat Tatli, Regional Manager for Asia at Meier's Weltreisen, one of Germany's leading tour operators, agrees.

In a www.n-tv.de feature, Tatli said that from a tourism perspective Khao Lak is where it was one year before the tsunami. He described Khao Lak as

"an up-and-coming destination with a lot of busy construction sites".

He said that the Kempinski Group is reconstructing and redesigning the former Sofitel Magic Lagoon Resort and that it is inevitable that more and more big resorts will be built in and around Khao Lak as wealthy investors have put Khao Lak back on their agenda.

The article also cited Khao Lak expat and travel guide author Richard Doring, who promotes the area on his website www.khaolak.de, where he says, "Tourists visiting Khao Lak are surprised to see that Khao Lak is almost back to normal after such a short time."

The online magazine also said that Khao Lak has regained pre-tsunami status with travel agents and operators. For example, travel service TUI listed sev-

en Khao Lak resorts in their *Asia Beautiful Holidays* summer catalog.

Similarly, FTI travel service listed eight Khao Lak resorts, Meier's Weltreisen listed nine and Neckermann Reisen listed seven. Neckermann Reisen Director Stefanie Berkin said that Khao Lak bookings for 2007 were far above average.

"It is expected that Khao Lak will soon be again the most important destination in southern Thailand," she said.

FTI reports that Khao Lak has regained 50% of its pre-tsunami status, but predicts that it will be back to normal by the 2007-2008 season.

Bettina Kraemer said that overall hotel occupancy reached 80% in the 2005-2006 high season and 90% this high season.

"In the long run it is not expected that the tsunami will have

any negative impact on tourism in Khao Lak, since our German clients have no negative associations regarding Khao Lak and prefer Khao Lak's tranquility over the crowded and busy Phuket," she said.


Main coarse or just desserts? In homage of our local restaurants. I'd like to recite the 2006

When tired of Thai food, a "Viena Schitsal", "Cordanblue", "Spagatti" or "Fried Magarone" has given me enough power to work into the late hours.





Former MP's son jailed for rape

aengrot "Ouan" Kanchana, son of a former Surat Thani Democrat MP, was sentenced on January 29 to 19 years and six months in prison for the rape and imprisonment of a Burmese women early last year.

Saengrot, son of former Surat Thani Region 3 constituency MP Chumphol Kanchana, was sentenced to 16 years in prison for the rape of "Miss Ya", a Burmese laborer.

He was also sentenced to eight years for grievous bodily harm and two years for wrongful imprisonment of his victim.

The total 26-year sentence was then reduced by a quarter in recognition of his cooperation with police.

Saengrot also had a sixmonth suspended sentence from a previous case added to his jail sentence, leaving a total of 20 years in prison to be served.

Saengrot, who showed no reaction to the sentence as it was read out, was escorted by guards to Surat Thani Provincial Prison. About 20 friends of Saengrot came to hear the sentence being handed down.

Transport troubles: Members of the Haad Yai Small Cars Cooperative staged a protest January 31 after the cooperative increased the number of *songtaew* (pickup trucks converted to carry passengers) serving the route between Haad Yai City and Haad Yai Airport without first consulting its members.

Claiming that more song-

taew would lead to a fall in their income, about 100 songtaew and tuk-tuk drivers protested outside the co-operative's offices on Niphat Songkroh Rd.

A songtaew driver, who asked to be named only as "Chai", said that the co-operative's decision to increase the number of vehicles on the route from central Haad Yai to the airport was making life difficult for drivers who already work that route

The protesters sent a representative to negotiate with the

co-operative's leaders, K. Chai said

If they could not reach a solution acceptable to the drivers, they would hold more protests, he said

Automatic arrest: Thirayut Srimuang, 29, a wanted *ya bah* (methamphetamine) dealer, was arrested in possession of a loaded M3 submachine gun as he was taking his wife to Phatthalung Provincial Hospital.

Phatthalung Governor Suthep Komlaphamon and Phattalung Provincial Police Commander Pol Maj Gen Kittisan Dechasunthawat on February 2 went along with Khao Chaison District Police, whose officers made the arrest

Thirayut was arrested for selling *ya bah* in 2005, but was released on bail. Police said that he resumed selling the drug and had managed to elude drug suppression officers who had been hunting for him since the end of 2006

On searching Thirayut's car, police discovered the gun behind the driver's seat. The magazine was loaded with 28 bullets.

Thirayut confessed that he

had bought the gun for 6,000 baht in Patthalung's Kong Ra District to defend himself while dealing ya bah, police said.

Playing nooky: The Head of the Nakhon Sri Thammarat Provincial Center for Improving the Student Behavior along with Nakhon Sri Thammarat Muang District Police raided a hotel room in the city on January 30, after receiving a tip-off two students had rented a room for sex.

After a passer-by reported seeing a male vocational-school student and a female high-school student going into the Bua Luang Hotel in Tambon Khlang, provincial truancy officer Somphong Yuthao called for police back up and rushed to the scene.

The hotel receptionist told the officers that a male student had just rented room 502. Police knocked on the door, then opened it to find a girl and a boy, both naked and scrambling for their clothes. After the pair ran into the bathroom and locked the door, officers ordered them to dress and come out for questioning.

The 18-year-old male student attended a private vocational college in the city. The girl, 14, was a student at a school in a

neighboring district, police said.

In the room police found and confiscated a pack of cigarettes and a box of birth control pills, of which three were missing.

K. Somphong said the pair told him they had both put on their uniform that morning as if they were going to school. After asking for some money from their parents, they then went to meet each other in Nakhon Sri Thammarat City, where the boy rented the hotel room.

The boy entered the room first, while the girl waited until the hotel receptionist was distracted before sneaking up to join him, he said.

They started to have sex, but were interrupted by the officers knocking at the door, he added.

The pair were taken to Nakhon Sri Thammarat Area 1 Education Office and their parents were called. When the girl's parents arrived, however, a fracas broke out. Officers had to step in to stop the parents, a teacher and a soldier, from beating their daughter, K. Somphong added.

The project, launched January 26, began with a two-day training course in trailing and sniffing skills.



"Most administrative problems have been found at the ministerial level and many shortcomings stem from overlapping jurisdiction and poor departmental coordination," she said.

The Ministries of Information and Communications Technology, Culture, and Tourism and Sports, which are most affected by globalization, are slated for internal restructuring, she added.

Defrocked: Police have arrested a defrocked abbot for allegedly raping an 18-year-old Australian.

The suspect, 59-year-old Munee Waewnokyoong, was defrocked by the monastic authorities as soon as the allegation was made against him.

Munee, formerly the monastic head of Bangkok's Dusit District, denied the allegations.

His alleged victim, who is of

Vietnamese descent, visited Munee on January 25 during her vacation. Munee is renowned among foreign tourists for his fortune-telling services.

When Munee saw the victim, he claimed bad luck had befallen her and that she should undergo a "ritual" to avoid "bad things". The girl followed him into his quarters, where he allegedly raped her. The victim reported the incident to the Australian Embassy, who then brought her to lodge a complaint with police.

Kanok Saengprasert, a senior official at the National Buddhism Bureau, said there were 300 complaints about monks' behavior last year, including five involving women.

Teaching travails: When it comes to careers, the nation's overworked teachers do not wish to see their children follow in their

footsteps, a survey by the Teacher Watch project has found.

Among the findings: 29% of teachers and 37% of school administrators wanted their children to take up teaching jobs; 62% of teachers and 43% of school administrators wanted early retirement; and 48% of teachers and 34% of school administrators had considered changing professions.

The Teacher Watch project conducted the nationwide survey between July and August last year. It covered teachers and school administrators in 1,350 schools. Project head Dr Amornwich Nakhonthap urged political parties to make education a priority, saying the future of the country did not lie in short-term economic needs alone.

He also expressed concern that "teacher" was no longer in the top 20 "dream careers" of children.

"The country needs wisdom and virtue from it's population and a good education system will help. But without good teachers, the education system can't be good."

Just the facts: The number of websites blocked by the Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Ministry has risen 500% since the coup, according to campaign group Freedom Against Censorship Thailand (FACT).

The "blocklist" numbered 13,435 websites as of January 11, compared with 2,475 on October 13 last year, the group said.

The huge jump showed "a frightening increase in thought control and abrogation of civil liberties and human rights in Thailand," FACT said in a statement.

The group said that the ICT, which does much of the censorship, has a budget of five billion

"It would appear Internet censorship is the only function of the Ministry of 'Information' yet the ICT [Ministry] discloses no information to the Thai taxpay-

he second annual Phuket International Blues Festival will take place at the Hilton Phuket Arcadia Resort and Spa at Karon Beach on February 16 and 17, with profits from the event earmarked for charity.

This year's festival will see a big pavilion to cater to the unlikely event of a February rain shower.







Excited by this concept, I did a check of my own accessories, just to see how I measure up.




notebook and remind myself why. The pen is a prestigious Lancer ballpoint that cost five baht


Nowadays, sidewalk vendors sell them for a pricey 99 baht. Thais think they're low class, but they're the most comfortable shirts in town.



THE HEART OF A

hirty-three years ago, Phuket-born Banjong Damklam, now 63, had a dream that set him on his way to being the administrator of the well-known Boon Tao Kong Shrine on the hill between Kathu to Patong.

The dream involved Chinese gods as well as spirits sitting on a tree that had fallen on a brokendown wall, he says, though at that time he had no idea what it meant.

The dream disturbed him enough that he sought the counsel of friends, who sent him to a medium at a Kathu Shrine.

After hearing K. Banjong recount his vision, the medium told him, "Go and take care of the Boon Tao Kong Shrine." But K. Banjong was worried that he had no experience and would not know how to manage the shrine.

"Just go and do it. Decide for yourself what needs to be done, and you will have no problems," he was told. And do it, he did.

Today, thousands of people each day pay their respects by honking their horns three times as they drive past the temple at the top of the hill.

The honking is to pay respect to Boon Tao Kong and to ask for safe passage over the mountain.

the shrine was selected for its

The dramatic location of which were hoped would bring good fortune. The shrine is high elevation and windy setting, named after the Chinese god it

was built to honor, Boon Tao Kong – a powerful deity that rides a tiger.

Upgrading the shrine was no easy task and has been his life's work, says K. Banjong. When he started, the road over Patong Hill was dirt and the shrine itself was small and dilapidated. It took him many years of slow progress to build it to its current size and beauty.

Initially, there was no money to get the job done. However, the Kathu medium suggested he put up a sign requesting donations,

and that was all that was needed to get things going. After that, donations of work and money began to arrive.


Among the donations, a millionaire's wife gave 70,000 baht and Patong Mayor Pian Keesin helped build the stairway up to the

In addition to his shrinekeeping duties, K. Banjong has also had to work to provide for his family.

When he took up his role at the shrine, he was working for a company selling agricultural fertilizers and chemical insect repel-

After the owner of the company died, he started his own business, also in fertilizer and agricultural chemicals. However, his business started failing, so he prayed to Boon Tao Kong. "Success soon came my way," he

Many others have had similar success at the shrine, says K. Banjong. People pray for a job, the return of a stolen motorcycle, and sometimes just for good luck. By his reckoning, some 80% of

the people find their prayers answered with success.

To repay for their prayers being answering, people bring meat, pig heads and chickens to the shrine – and

sometimes set up movies for passers-by to watch. K. Banjong donates the goods to local schools, poor people living in Kathu and to various foundations.

The meat products are brought to the shrine as they are thought to please the tiger that the God rides.

One story the administrator tells is of a devotee who returned to the shrine with garlands of flowers instead of the meat that was promised, and the flowers burst into flame. The person was terrified, but K. Banjong calmed the anxious devotee through guidance, telling him to explain to Boon Tao Kong why he could not do as he had promised in his prayers.

Another of K. Banjong's talents is the interpretation of the fortune-telling sticks used at the shrine. Each stick contains a message for the devotee. They are shaken about in a small container and the first one that falls out brings a message.

The messages are written in poetic form and K. Banjong helps people read and understand the meaning of their fortune and what they should do about it.

K. Banjong is semi-retired now as he closed his business six months ago, though he still looks after the shrine and supervises the two other junior shrine keepers – his son and his son's wife.

He finds administering the shrine tiring as he needs to collect and keep track of the donations and often doesn't get home to bed until about 2 am.

A strong believer in karma, K. Banjong says, "If people do good things, they will get good things, and if you do good things, you don't need to pray."

Kathu students win awards

knew it wouldn't work, him and I. To begin with, his dress sense would be weird in public – all those skimpy loincloths and armor. But that didn't stop me from fantasizing. What is it about gladiators? Their reckless bravery, the sexual charge of survival against all odds?

You will of course be thinking of Russell Crowe. Nice body. great special effects. But my admission is much more shameful - my gladiator was old enough to be Crowe's father.


But we are talking pre-pubescent passion here. I was about 11 when I first saw Spartacus. Kirk Douglas must have been pushing 40. If I press the right button in my memory I can still taste the excitement and hopeless longing of it all. Maybe you have similar memories? The first teenage crush that gets out of hand and threatens to drown you.

It all started in the front room of our house in London. When, at the end of his magnificent, doomed slave rebellion, Spartacus died on the cross, I cried for hours. Family legend has it that I was inconsolable.

When they repeated it again I cried from the opening credits - we're talking a three-and-ahalf-hour epic here – because I knew what was going to happen. My mother described it as highvoltage hysteria, but I loved every minute of it.

I didn't see it as obsessive, of course. I probably didn't even understand the word. But obsessive it was, in its own nauseous, teenage way. Within a week I had written a groveling letter to the film company, which duly sent me a set of stills from the movie. My room became a shrine to the doomed slave rebellion of 73 BC.

I saw the movie a dozen times. I knew Douglas's scenes by heart. When I wasn't watching it, I was reliving it. I sat in school daydreaming of Spartacus. I read and re-read the Howard Fast novel on which the film was based. At night I would fantasize about the scene in the cell where he was given a woman for the night, but is too chivalrous to touch her. "We're not animals." "Oh I don't know, Kirk, I don't mind."



Truly, madly, deeply.

Simmons, his co-star, that for months I went to bed every night repeating over and over, "I have high cheekbones too", because someone told me about the power of suggestion. Was anyone ever so young? It appears I was.

My passion seemed to last forever. I think the corners on the photographs started to curl around the time Paul Weller tore into the early 1980s music culture,

sweeping me and a generation of pre-pubescent girls with him. No false chivalry there.

Looking back, I feel a certain fondness for all that passion, all that lack of control. The sweet pain of unrequited obsessive love. Because that's just what it was. A dress rehearsal for the

real thing. A rite of passage as important as boys' wet dreams.

By the time it passed I was exhausted and post-pubescent. If I couldn't have sex with Kirk Douglas I could at least have sex with someone else. It's a strange thing, obsessive love. On one level it's a state to aspire to. Glamorous. Poetic. Dramatic. Technicolor – the stuff of art. While you probably wouldn't want to end up under the 11:15 to St Petersburg, who hasn't had just a touch of envy for Anna Karenina? Or wished to experience the kind of love affair where the voltage is so high you singe the world around you as you burn?

Except Anna was lucky in

I wanted so bad to be Jean some ways – at least Vronsky loved her back, even if he couldn't live up to it. But then, who can? That's the built-in fault line of this kind of love. Where obsessive love is truly reciprocal it moves into another genre altogether.

Troilus and Cressida, Abelard and Heloise, Romeo and Juliet – not a lot of happy endings there. Equally obsessed, equally doomed.

In real life, of course, most

of us experience the Mark II level. Not fatal but just as painful – the unrequited version. If you've ever been the object of it, you may hardly have noticed: the guy who doesn't let up, the sad, even mad, idiot who can't take a hint. An object of ridicule rather than tragedy. When you

are the one doing the loving it's earth-shattering. Even the humiliation is epic. It's not easy to admit to, even when time has grafted new skin over the wound. Writers, of course, have the art of fiction through which to process their experiences and those of others. Recognize any of the feelings in the following story?

"He was different from anyone she had ever met, a man of the world who had gone places and written about them. His eyes shone as he spoke of what he had seen and they continued shining when he looked at her. Understandably, perhaps, she mistook this glow for something special.

"After their second meeting they found themselves spending the evening together. One thing led to another, which in turn led to bed. Ask her now and she might admit it was a fairly routine coupling, certainly nothing registering on the Richter scale. But 'it' must have happened afterwards.

"Maybe it came to her in her sleep, like Titania in A Midsummer Night's Dream: Puck slipping through her window and staining her eyelids with the juice of some love drug so the first thing she sees when she wakes she adores. 'Oh, Bottom, thou art transformed.'

"Obsession came upon her like an illness. Initially it was delirium. For the first few days she had trouble breathing, such was the sustained level of adrenaline. She could feel her own heart beating a base track to a million sappy love songs.

"It took a week for her euphoria to sour – something to do with how quiet the telephone was. She would pick it up occasionally to check the dialing tone.

"In the end, she broke down, called him and spoke to his answering machine, leaving a jaunty message – nothing heavy, no hint of obsession to put him off. Maybe he was busy. Maybe he was away. Maybe he took it at face value. Whatever, he did not reply.

"She became mildly deranged, found excuses to drive down his road at strange hours. One night she dressed up and drove to his house. She parked nearby and spent an hour reading the street plan in the hope that he might see her and she could say she'd got lost looking for a party.

"Friends comforted, joked, became concerned and finally lost


patience. It had – as one said to her - grown out of hand. Of course she knew that, knew that somehow she'd fallen victim to a capricious heart disease, though by now its symptoms were more like advanced emotional cystitis - all irritation and itch, with the very act of scratching bringing more pain than relief.

She was moving from mania into decline when finally fate intervened. She was offered a job abroad and packed her illness with her clothes. But somewhere under different skies, meeting different people, the symptoms started to fade.

"When she returned, winter had turned to spring and none of the messages on her answering machine were from him. She sat in her living room and laughed before she cried, for there was loss as well as relief. She had left her job and bought a ticket to a continent she'd never visited. When she came back she wrote a novel about it. While it's possible that none of these events were connected, she chose to believe that they were. But when you think you're going to die, getting better is a serious as well as a joyful thing."

The "she" of this story is not me, in case you were wondering, but she does come pretty close in many – mostly embarrassing - details. Reliving some of them for this column I was struck by how fresh their memory is, the pain unwithered by age or time...

death and mourning – not exactly the mood you want to evoke on a romantic evening.



our husband's cheating on you. You are too shy to ask the girl you've had your eye on out for a date. The nice young lady you met in a bar in Soi Bangla has cleaned you out and run off with another man. These are all problems that Silvia Fauck can help with.

Of course, you'll have to fly to Germany, where the 53year-old psychological counselor operates that country's only therapy center for lovesickness.

"If your partner suddenly leaves you for no reason at all, it can be as bad as losing a dear friend or relative. Lovesickness is with you every waking hour of the day," she says.

Fauck knows what she's talking about. Not long ago she was sent a fax by her partner of four-and-a-half years, telling her he was ending their relationship.

"Of course, now it would be an SMS," she says. "That's often what I hear from young people coming to me for advice," she said.

She has just moved to Berlin from Hamburg, where she opened a center in 2001, advising people how to deal with personal crises caused by the loss of a partner, bullying, burn-out or the illness of a loved one.

She soon discovered that 90% of the people who came to see her were experiencing problems in their personal relationships, mostly lovesickness.

That's when she decided to concentrate on mending broken hearts.

"It's not just a matter of talking and listening. In many sessions dealing with this topic it's important to sort out the feelings and the thoughts of my clients.

"Once the head is clear you can move on to the next step – removing self-doubt, providing encouragement and rebuilding self-confidence."

She says it is important for the lovelorn to ask them-

selves what caused the break up of their relationship, whether they failed to spot any warning signs, are they are being honest with themselves and what they can learn for future relationships.

Her clients range in age

from 21 to 70 and come from all walks of life, including students, politicians, doctors and actors. She has noticed lately that more men than women are seeking her advice.

"Men don't like to talk openly about their personal

problems. If something's wrong, a woman might discuss it with her hairdresser or her mother. A man won't tell anyone close to him," she says.

"You might have a man coming to me saying, 'I'm happily married, but I've fallen for my secretary. My wife suspects that something's up. I don't know what to do.'

"Another manager complained that he was having problems with his job. It soon became clear that everything was okay at work; it was his personal life that was a mess."

Fauck, who has two grown up daughters, says her clients fall into three groups. The first are those who have just been abandoned by their partners and don't know why. Bad sex, she says, rarely causes the break-up of a relationship.

The second group concerns women and men who are in a relationship, but who have started an affair and don't know what to do about it.

The third group are in

their 30s, educated, good looking and successful in their jobs, but incapable of maintaining a relationship.

This, she believes, has something to do with the changing roles of men and women.

"The roles used to be clearly defined. The woman needed a man as a provider, they had more time for each other. It's often the case today that the relationship starts to crumble when the daily routine sets in. Many people feel there has to be something better."

Some clients need just one or two sessions, others several months of counseling. The longest has been with her for two-and-a-half years. She also has a telephone hotline that people can ring.

Fauck, who claims to have salvaged countless marriages with her advice, has just written a book. It's called *Lovesickness* and offers tips on how to cope when your heart threatens to break.

ou don't have to like golf to visit Mission Hills – which sprawls north of Shenzhen just over the border from Hong Kong – but it certainly helps.

This – and the chaps at Guinness will vouch for it – is the world's largest golf course, with 216 holes, which even the most arithmetically challenged should be able to deduce works out at a dozen 18-holers.

They've been put together by the Who's Who of modern golf designers. Nicklaus, Duval, Faldo, Leadbetter, Dye, Ozaki, Olazabal, Els, Singh, Norman, Sorenstam and home-grown champion Zhang Lian Wei. Check in for a week or a tad longer and, given enough energy, you might just be able to play the lot, especially as three courses are floodlit till 2 am.

If you have the money to spare, and this is the case for quite a few mainland Chinese, you don't have to bother with staying at the Mission Hills hotel. Stately residences, complete with huge reception rooms, swathes of bedrooms and bathrooms, private swimming pools, gardens, and of course, servants' quarters, are dotted about the courses. The going price is roughly 157 million baht. Quite a few have been bought with cash.

A current aphorism doing the rounds in China is that you talk golf in the office and business on the course. Hence the hordes of eager young and old

executives at Mr Leadbetter's celebrated academy frantically polishing their swings.

Their spouses – sometimes daringly referred to as "golf widows" – shouldn't want for entertainment off-course. They can spa themselves from top to toe non-stop in tailor-made and sparkling facilities, or simply give the credit card a bit of a going over among the designer labels at Mission Hills' retail arcades. There are also 51 championship tennis courts, as well as facilities for

squash, badminton and basketball, and a gym that fairly bristles with the latest work-out gizmos.

Golf might be the new craze in the People's Republic, but food remains one of its strongest cultural anchors. The latest addition to the Mission Hills' empire is the grandiose Dongguan Clubhouse, featuring – among a bevy of other facilities – a food court that embraces Chinese, Italian and Asian cuisines, whose tables are packed with hungry diners all hours of the day.

So Mr Golfer has a good round, Mrs Non-Golfer maintains her body beautiful, they both dine well in the evening, and everybody's happy. Even children, if they've been brought along for the ride, should be moderately content here as they can romp about a Swedish-designed playground.

Happiest of all must be David Chu Shu Ho, the visionary Hong Kong tycoon who put Mission Hills together. And here's the amazing thing. A few decades

back these pristine greens and beautifully landscaped courses were all paddy fields and forest. Golf was a four-letter word in China, regarded in every sense as vastly inferior to ping-pong.

So take a quick pass through Mission Hills nowadays, and you are not simply seeing some of the world's biggest and best in the way of golf, but precisely how China has picked itself up by it's boot straps and the way its going to be forging ahead for years to come.

Pizzas with Thai pizzazz

or a new twist on pizza and pasta, The Cook restaurant in Phuket City offers some tasty Thai fusion options as well as traditional local and European dishes, all at reasonable prices. Located on Phang Nga Rd, just down from the On On and Sinthavee hotels, the eatery is a favorite of locals, expats and backpackers.

The owner and chef is Bultham Bulrid, 40, who opened the restaurant in December 2005. Before then, he had worked for more than a decade as a baker at Le Meridien Phuket Beach Resort, and worked parttime in an Italian restaurant run by his brother-in-law.

He left the Meridien in 2004 to run a pizza stall at the old night market near the bus station in Phuket City. The stall lasted only about six months, so K. Bultham tried the same concept at Bar Tango in Soi Pattana, but again was unsuccessful. He tried again near Kajonkietsuksa School on Chao Fa West Rd, but couldn't make a go of it there, either.

His travails finally led him to rent his present shop, where he has made a hit with his inexpensive traditional Italian pasta and Thai dishes.

The classic pasta dishes, such as Spaghetti Bolognese and Carbonara, are priced at 60 to 90 baht.

K. Bultham also offers Thai variations on pizzas, such as Green Chicken Curry, Red Chicken or Pork, Chicken Basil Leaf, Spicy Muslim Chicken, Tom Yum Seafood, most priced around 120 or 130 baht.

Also with a local twist are his desserts, such as Corn Pizza and Banana Pizza (recommended with ice cream) and Durian Ice Cream.

K. Bultham explains that he wanted to create some distinctive Thai variations on Western food, offering something uniquely local.

The food is consistently good here, as affirmed by the steady flow of regulars. Also a nice touch is the complimentary watermelon and baby bananas offered après meal.

Paradise found – with beers

t's a great job if you can get it. Travel writer Stu Lloyd convinced his pub lisher to send him around the world in search of Paradise.

The result is Gone Troppo (Monsoon Books, Singapore, 2006, 304pp). Stu Lloyd is the right man for the job, author of the three-volume Hardship Posting series: True Tales of Expatriate Misadventures in Asia. Furthermore, he spent a third of his life in Africa, a third in Asia and a third in Australia.

His first stop is South Africa, where he grew up. This country of beaches and mountains is as beautiful as ever, though troubled by a huge surge in street crime: muggings, shootings, carjackings.

Still there are signs of hope. Lloyd revisits his old primary school: "And I immediately noticed the ratio of black kids to white kids. About 90:10, respectively, whereas in my day it was 0:100.

"The Africans are much better students,' said the headmaster. 'They value education more."

Then he's off on a very rough, accident-prone sailboat trip from Phuket to Langkawi. This makes for high comedy, dominated by the colorful Captain Horst of Big A.

But he finds Langkawi boring and gratefully heads back to Thailand and Koh Samui. Despite the island's hideous over development, he attains days of tranquility at a little resort.

"I sat in the sala, watching pink fingers of light massage the sky," he writes.



"Soon they became golden, like a kaleidoscopic image changing position, and the whole sky seemed to sit lower. The water went out in sympathy, creating a floor, wall and roof of gold leaf. One hundred meters down the beach, a solitary lithe female appears on the sand reaching for the heavens in angular yet graceful tai-chi poses. As I sipped my chilled Singha, the smoldering orb gradually tucked itself in behind the dinosaur spines of the Marine Park on the horizon. The world was a perfect place."

His Filipina wife flies up from Australia to join him for a homecoming to Manila.

I should mention here that Lloyd is an Aussie and beer-drinking is a serious concomitant to any version of paradise. His wife's relatives lead him on many a happy chase via San Miguel. The couple take off on a jeep trip to the north of Luzon. Off another island, Bohol, they scuba

dive down glorious coral reefs and take in y and figured, what the hell, I'll toss it in. the sights such as the Chocolate Hills:

"Hundreds and hundreds of perfectly conical mounds of varying size stretch beyond the horizon. Like Toblerone choc-

olate bars. I imagined that this is how a fly - with its many, many sets of eyes feeding simultaneous visions to the brain – might view Dolly Parton."

Why he chooses the hellhole of Delhi in his search for paradise beats me but Goa does give him scope to combine the lyrical and the ludicrous.

"Farm buildings in violent dashes of greens, blues, pinks, splashed the countryside, most sporting unevenly pitched tiled roofs. Elegant-looking women in a jubilee of

graceful blue and purple saris, gold necklaces and hoop earrings, sought out a suitable place on the riverbank for their morning dump.'

Similarly, why he picks the awful Tijuana as a candidate for paradise is a mystery, unless he had already written the sto-

But he is on solid ground in Hawaii and Costa Rica where he makes the case for Corcovado National Park with its combination of lush primary forest and tur-

quoise water teeming with manta rays and whale sharks.

His traveling companion is another beer-guzzling Aussie and after one hilarious night of singing karaoke, they bid farewell to their newfound friends and waltz out into the night.

"We were so delightfully, deliriously drunk, Hunter S. Thompson could've been our designated driver."

But he finally finds true Paradise in Rarotonga in the Cook Islands. While kayaking near the beach he spies a

Polynesian princess, dressed in denim shorts and a floral bikini top, who favors him with a dazzling smile.

"That was it. Eureka! It was like a spiritual epiphany. I didn't know exactly what defined Paradise, but I felt like I was in it right there and then."

Aids threat remains

It has been almost a quarter of a century since the human-immunodeficiency virus (HIV) that causes acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (Aids) was first identified. When US basketball legend Magic Johnson bravely announced he was HIV-positive back in 1991, how many people thought he would still be alive and healthy in 2007?

Increased public awareness about HIV/Aids and the high-risk behavior that spreads the disease has helped to prevent HIV from becoming the doomsday killer that many had predicted it would be back when it was first isolated. Also, the continual development of effective anti-retroviral therapies has helped those already infected with the virus from developing the disease.

Over time, HIV/Aids has developed into a global pandemic, but one with high infection rates in areas with poor standards of living and low literacy rates.

Thailand's Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) has for years run one of the world's most effective HIV/Aids awareness campaigns, leading to a dramatic reduction in the incidence of HIV infection in the country. More recently, the government took the bold step of allowing generic versions of the anti-retroviral drugs Kaletra and Efavirenz, over the strong objections of their international patent holders, so that sufferers in Thailand could afford them.

However, the current government has slashed funding for its nationwide HIV/Aids awareness campaigns to 20 million baht in 2007. This is a steep reduction from the 50 million baht earmarked to HIV/Aids prevention in 2006, though some of this funding has been redirected to local administrative bodies as part of the governments decentralization plan.

While the *Gazette* generally supports decentralization, this is a poor development given the MoPH's excellent track record in HIV prevention. Can we really expect local agencies to come up with something better if they directly receive the funding?

Local public health officials now fear that HIV could stage a comeback through sex among teenagers and young adults, who are less likely to practice safe sex [see Inside Story, pp 4-5].

Being a tourist destination with a renowned nightlife industry offering pay-for-play sexual services, it is perhaps not surprising that Phuket has the second highest per capita incidence of HIV infection of all the southern provinces.

For this reason alone, it is necessary not only to keep up the MoPH's good work with its traditional target groups, but also to take the battle against HIV into the schools – even if it is against the wishes of conservative school administrators.

With a killer such as HIV, there is never room for complacency.

Phuket's cultural heritage is sorely undervalued

hen I go to other countries, I like to learn about their cultural and social origins; which is what impressed me about Australia, especially the Immigration Museum in Melbourne.

They have so many different nationalities living there – it's like if the map of Australia was a big plate of salad, you could see the color of each vegetable so clearly, such as the green lettuce, red chilli, white onion and orange carrot, but it's all joined together by the salad dressing of Australian nationality.

So all these cultures are living together, individually distinct but united by their Australian nationality. This is better than a melting pot of soup, each culture retains its individual value.

Many people who travel are intelligent and educated, so we shouldn't look down on all tourists as just being interested in sun, surf and [partying]; many want to learn about the people and culture of Phuket, which doesn't mean just Patong.

Look at Singapore, an island about the size of ours, with a population [of only about four and a half million], but richer than the whole country of Thailand.

ums. They try to sell everything about the culture of their country, they have Little India and Chinatown for tourists to see...

I think it is time to take action before it's too late. Local people, besides Patong business owners, should have income from tourism. What do local people get from tourism in Phuket?

My idea is that if we are making money from cultural heritage tourism, we will also get intangible rewards, such as communal pride in Phuket.

Young people will then be motivated to maintain our cultural traditions because they will see our actions and the practical rewards. This is much more effective than just telling them to remember their heritage.

Most people in the tourism industry overlook this because Phuket has so many beautiful and interesting things. We can't blame

anyone for this – we have beautiful beaches so tourists usually head to the beach.

Don't forget the tsunami...Many Phuket people banded together to transport victims and offer food, water and clothes to tourists and take them to the airport.

Foreigners have told me that locals kept asking, 'Do you need anything, money, clothes or food?'

Culture-based tours should be started soon, especially in Phuket City where we have so many good places to see; such as Phra Phitak Chyn Pracha house, Thai Hua Museum and Pud Jow Shrine.

I think Singapore is a good example of a country with the intelligence to market its culture, even though it is a newer country with a relatively small population. Phuket has a culture that is very old and interesting, but we never present it.

It would be good if all of the younger generation in Phuket started to wear sarongs; it would be better than everyone wearing jeans.

I can remember when, just 50 years ago, Phuket had a population of only 65,000, but look at how it is increasing with the influx of foreign residents, Burmese workers and people from other provinces.

For me, it's like I'm trying to blow the whistle to warn people that our Phuket heritage will be forgotten, but nobody is interested. But I will keep blowing until I can't do it anymore.

Businessmen are always thinking about businesses that could make money, but I think if they tried to sell our outstanding and unique culture, they could make money from that too.

How can I become the legal guardian of my child?

I am the European father of a five-year-old boy. My name is listed as the *natural* father on the birth certificate and I was the person who registered his birth. His Thai mother, whom I never married, left us long ago and is nowhere to be found, although I believe that she may be abroad.

Before she left, she changed the boy's family name. In a court filing at the time, she acknowledged that I was the natural father. Now I would like to change his name back as it was.

Meanwhile, I would like to travel abroad with my son, who has a Thai passport, without encountering any problems at Immigration. How do I go about this? I have asked two lawyers and received two different responses. I would appreciate any help on this matter.

As you and your son's mother were not married when your son's birth was registered, the mother has sole rights as his guardian. You may be the boy's natural father, but you have no legal right to take the child out of the country or to change either the boy's given or family name.

To do either, you must be his registered guardian. For you to become the guardian, you and the mother must go the district office where the child is registered on the house registration document (tabien baan). The mother must provide written permission and

testify in person before you can become his guardian.

If she refuses, or if you are unable to contact her, you can apply to the Provincial Juvenile and Family Court in the same province where the boy was registered on the *tabien baan* for permission to become the sole guardian of the child. You will need to take your son, your passport, your son's birth certificate and the house registration document on which he is registered, as well as a person willing to testify in support of your application.

The court may ask for additional supporting evidence and will allow 60 days for the lodging of objections to your application.

If the court finds you to be a suitable guardian, it will issue a written permission that you can take to the District Office to apply for sole guardianship.

Once your application to be the boy's legal guardian has been approved, you may then take your son out of the country. You may also change his name.

Why do I have to leave Thailand after 90 days?

I recently went to the Immigration Office in Phuket City to extend my non-immigrant O visa after staying 80 days in Phuket.

I was told that I could not – even though the visa is valid – and that I must leave Thailand and then re-enter the country in order to be issued a new 90-day permit to stay.

I knew the tourist visa laws had changed but was unaware that non-immigrant O visa rules had changed as well. Can you clarify this for me?

Pol Capt Krissarat Nuesen of the Phuket Provincial Immigration Office, replies:

It seems that you did not qualify to have your permit to stay extended, for example by being married to a Thai or by qualifying as a person wanting to stay here on retirement [ie, having enough money in a Thai bank – *Gazette*].

A person who has a multiple-entry non-immigrant O visa and does not qualify to have his permit to stay extended must leave the Kingdom at any border, such as at Ranong or Sadao, and re-enter the country in order to be permitted to stay a further 90 days

You, as a person with a nonimmigrant O visa, will be permitted to re-enter the country repeatedly until the visa expires.

However, a person staying in Thailand on a tourist visa issued on arrival is currently allowed to stay no more than 90 days within any period of 180 days.

Once the 90 days have passed, the person will not be permitted to re-enter Thailand for 90 days.

KEEPING THE SPIES AT BAY

recently received an email from WM in Bangkok with advice on how to make your computer run faster.

Although WM means well, the advice is simply wrong – and it worries me that there are still many people out there who believe computer "urban myths" that should have been dispelled

Apologies, WM, for printing this tip verbatim, but I've done so because it contains many misconceptions that confuse people here in Phuket.

Spyware is a huge problem, right up there with spam, but it doesn't just lazily infect your computer when you visit a lot of websites.

Apart from some very rare exceptions, which I could count on one hand, the only way you can get spyware on your com-

puter is if you deliberately install

Unfortunately, the cretins who make spyware have come up with very sneaky ways of convincing you to install their programs, and they rarely give you fair warning.

Spyware can cause all sorts of problems. It might even cause halitosis, but it doesn't significantly slow down your day-to-day web surfing.

Even third-party cookies, which are similar to spyware, have a minimal effect on Internet speed (see en.wikipedia. org/ wiki/HTTP_cookie).

Ad-Aware used to be the top choice among anti-spyware

> products. I recommended it in several books years ago, but it hasn't kept up. At

this point, there are two better alternatives.

The first one, I hate to say, is Microsoft's Windows Defender. It's free for owners of genuine MS products.

Many people (present company included) don't trust antispyware software from a company that's played footsie with big-time spyware companies.

That's why I don't recommend Windows Defender. That said, it is a credible product that does a decent job protecting you from most spyware from most scummy companies.

If you want to use Windows Defender, your computer must clear the "Windows Genuine Advantage" (WGA) hurdle. In or-

der to clear that hurdle, you must download and install the latest WGA software – the notorious phone-home version, which I call 'Windows Genuine Spyware''.

If you feel confident that you have a copy of Windows XP that passes (this week's version of) the WGA test, and you don't mind setting up your copy of Windows XP to contact Microsoft periodically so the 'Softies can keep track of your computer, go to www.microsoft.com/athome/ security/spyware/software/ default.mspx to download and install the latest versions of both WGA and Windows Defender.

I use and recommend Webroot Spy Sweeper. It costs about 1,300 baht. You can download a trial copy from www.webroot. com and see if it works for you.

Windows Secrets Newsletter publishes a constantly-updated list of recommended security products at www.windows secrets.com/reviews/securitybaseline. If you want to protect your computer, that's a great

If your Internet is slow -

especially in Thailand – you probably want to look toward the ISP for an explanation before you go scouring your hard drive.

On a cheerful note, CAT has lowered prices for EV-DO service.

I didn't believe it either, but if you drop by your friendly local CAT office (in Phuket City on Phang Nga Road, or in Patong's Aroonsom Plaza near Andaman Beach Suites), you can see for yourself.

CAT will sell you the Sierra Wireless AirCard 580 for 15,990 baht. That's expensive, the card has been discontinued by the manufacturer, but it works, and works well.

When you buy the card, you get free, unlimited service until the end of April. Starting May 1, you pay 590 baht per month. That's about half what CAT used to charge – and it compares very favorably with similar 3G service anywhere else in the world.

You need a PCMCIA slot in your computer to plug in the AirCard. Most laptop computers have PCMCIA slots. Some newer laptops don't, so be careful when shopping for a new laptop.

If you have a desktop, it probably doesn't have a PCM-CIA slot, so you need to install an adapter. I picked up a few of them on my last trip to Bangkok, and have them available at my Sandwich Shoppe, while they last, for 1,500 baht.

As far as I've seen, CAT's EV-DO service still runs rings around every ADSL package on the island, except for CAT's direct lines (which run faster, but cost 2,600 baht per month).

I've heard from many readers who see "real" 400 to 800 K bits per second download speeds in most parts of Phuket, and many other places in Thailand.

One reader says he even got a signal at the Andaman Club in Burma, off Ranong. Many readers found there was little slowdown after the earthquake in Taiwan. I have no idea why.

Considering my TOTADSL line currently runs about 30Kbps on a good day with a stiff tail wind, EV-DO makes a whole lot-



Expatriates often find that the bank they use on an international basis is so large that dealing with it is a disturbingly impersonal experience.

Depositors are merely numbers in a gigantic entity that never offers much in the way of assistance or personalized service.



SilkAir inks US\$1.3bn deal to expand fleet

SINGAPORE: SilkAir has signed an agreement with Airbus to buy up to 20 new A320-family aircraft: 11 on firm order and nine on option. At list prices, the order is worth US\$1.328 billion (46.7 billion baht). Deliveries are scheduled from 2009 through to 2012.

SilkAir Chief Executive Mike Barclay said the orders put SilkAir in a good position to expand the airline in the next few years.

"We see good opportunities for profitable growth in our region. Increasing prosperity and rapid economic development are providing many opportunities for people to travel, and SilkAir is pleased to be playing a role by connecting South Asian regional centers with Singapore," he said.

The orders also signify SilkAir's intention not to bow to pressure from low-cost carriers' entry to the market three years ago.

Other moves to secure their market have included refitting cabin interiors, introducing new uniforms and stepping up customer service training.

By focusing on flight timings and connectivity, meals, and in-flight service, SilkAir over the past three years has seen passenger numbers increase 100%, with a 125% increase in the number of business-class passengers.

Mr Barclay added that not dropping any services to Phuket after the tsunami has put the airline "in good alignment" with many travel agents in Singapore and Phuket, which has in turn facilitated the airline's recent good performance.

"Post tsunami, we never dropped a flight to Phuket. In the short term, we had to bear the low loads, but it has paid back. We had lots of new customers who had never flown with us... The agents also appreciated our support of the route and we're still doing lots of promotions with them," he said.

In its latest move to expand services in the region, SilkAir in November added a fifth service that allows late arrivals to Singapore, and connections with flights to Japan as well as long-haul connections to Australia, Europe and the US.

PHUKET: Organizers of the Phang Nga Bay Regatta (PNB) have closed the entries list for this year's event, to be held from February 16 to 20. Some 50 boats pre-registered and the regatta's maximum of 45 boats have already paid and confirmed

Simon James, long-standing Race Officer for the PNB, told the Gazette, "We set an initial limit of 45 boats, but we will be flexible. Of course, the boats that have already paid are already included."

The volunteer organizing committee this year set a limit for the number of entries at 45 boats as the logistics of having so many vachts, and the hundreds of crew members sailing on them, arriving at a new anchorage each day poses difficulties.

James confirmed that this year yachts will race in five classes: one Racing class, two Cruising classes and two Multihull classes – the Firefly 850s will have a class of their own.

Scott Duncanson, who won last year's PNB on G4S, better known as the locally-built Phuket 8 Somtam Express, will be back to defend his title.

"He has threatened to race with trapezes to get the acrossthe-bay record back," said

Last year Roger Kingdon's Firefly Moto Inzi screamed across the bay from Phi Phi Don to Ao Chalong in an unofficial record time of 2 hours 13 minutes.

Notably missing from the King's Cup Regatta (KCR) in

December, John Vause will be back racing on Ruby Tuesday.

There are also rumors that David Lindahl, who missed the KCR due to poor health, will return to racing at the PNB Regatta. However, it has not been confirmed whether he will sail on Phoenix or La Samudra, on which Lindahl finished second in the Racing class last year.

Minx will also be back to defend its title as Cruising A class winners, though Cinders and Simba, which finished second and third respectively last year, have not entered.

"One boat to watch in the Racing Class will be former KCR winner Ben Copley on his new Asia Spirit, which will be sailing her inaugural regatta in Thailand," said James.

The second day's racing, the SEA Yachting Around The Islands Race, will test the fleet's skills, winding their way past the islands off Krabi, where the evening party will be held at Krabi Resort in Ao Nang.

The third day will see the boats head downwind to Phi Phi, where four adjacent resorts on Phi Phi Don's northern tip will welcome the hundreds of sailors with a beach party.

Puravarna, the regatta's principal sponsor this year, has planned a huge final party, a combination regatta finale and Chinese New Year bash for which they have chartered a special plane to fly in stars, models and press from Bangkok.

The famed Bed Supper Club of Sukhumwit has been hired to organize a huge beach party with DJ music, dance, shows, fireworks and a dinner banquet, which is expected to be one of the most memorable party events on Phuket's calendar this year.

he one-billion-baht, fivestar Best Western Premier Supalai Resort and Spa Phuket is 90% complete and scheduled to have its soft opening on February 14, with the grand opening following in April.

We can see the sailboats, yachts and ferries cruising along the bay in the morning and evening," he said.

"We believe in Best Western management and that its marketing will help this project set the standard for the eastern coastline," he added.

Accommodation at the resort is of four types: 80 Deluxe Sea View rooms, 40 Super Deluxe Sea View rooms, 24 Grand

"Our hotel is five-star but we have four-star prices. Our prices are average compared with other hotels on the east coast. It costs about US\$100-130 a night for rooms and about US\$140 to US\$160 a night for pool-side villas during opening period," he said.

"We offer full in-room fa-

cilities, such as a sofa that can be converted into an extra bed, a breakfast table, ceiling fan, rain shower and so on. Our service will be innovative and even start at the airport," he said. The hotel also boasts a MICE (Meetings, Incentives, Conventions and Exhibitions) convention center that can seat 400 people.

The main lobby building includes the "Pano-Restaurant", named after the panorama it offers, where people can dine in air conditioning or in the open air.

The ground floor of the lobby building has a fitness room and a fully-fitted spa, including steam and sauna rooms and a Jacuzzi, and a large outdoor swimming pool with a pool bar where the guests can enjoy the sea view.





Effective illumination

ust up the hill behind Baan Chalong School is a house blending Thai tradition and Western innovation. It is the creation of Ian Potter, an English creative lighting designer and owner of Andaman Lighting, and his wife, K. Sutisa, an interior designer.

Mr Potter explained that his business has exposed him and his wife to the interiors and exteriors to some of the finest contemporary tropical houses on the island, providing the main source of their inspiration.

They have taken that inspiration and adapted it to the locale – almost every facet of the house incorporates some aspect of sun, sea or verdure.

Indeed, loving attention to detail is evident throughout the home from the multi-colored levels, the ponds and waterfall pool, to the fabric on the sala cushions to the rustic guest house bathroom backed by jungle greenery.

Of course, the Potters gave special attention to the lighting. Among the illuminated features is a covered walkway of handmade bricks linking the living and guest sections of the complex. Niches in the brick wall contain Buddha images that are spotlit at night to dramatic effect.

On the roof, the ornamental curved barge boards are lit from behind to project the shadow of the decorative shape onto the house opposite.

Round wooden pillars on the ground level are lit by two boxes at the top of both sides of each pillar, creating beams of light that pool at the base.

The square brick pillars are lit from below by lights in the pond, accentuating the rough texture of the brick.

The curved, paneled teak ceiling is floodlit from below to highlight the feeling of immense space. Lights are positioned on top of beams running across the width of the room at the point


where wall meets ceiling; while spot lights at the top of the curtains run light down their length.

hy are we fascinated by smells? The sense of smell is a weird thing – it doesn't matter whether the odor that hits your nostrils is sweet and pleasant or totally minging (that's unpleasant, by the way, before any Americans start reaching for their dictionary), we are somehow drawn to smells of all kinds.

What happens next? "Sniff this," they say, "it's absolutely foul." Of this there is no doubt – you've just watched their face screw up in disgust. So what do you do? Obviously you give the nastiness a hearty inhale for yourself. We all know how we'll react, but we do the deed anyway. Madness.

Then there's the old night-gift syndrome. The sort of smells that are somehow only produced once you get into bed at night. Why is it that we really want to know the magnitude of the gaseous emission we've just produced under the covers? We know it's quite likely to be unpleasant, but the truth must be known. Up come the covers, to find out for sure.

Unfortunately, the wife finds this fascination somewhat less appealing. It doesn't matter how many times you lift the sheets, give them a waft and say to her "Get a load of this one love, it's a cracker"; she's quite unlikely to

share your enthusiasm. The "Dutch oven", as a friend of mine refers to it. He really knows how to charm the ladies.

Then there are other smells, which are totally subjective. Personally I consider durian to be one of the most odious substances on the planet. To me it smells like molten, moldy cheese festering in a nylon footballer's sock that he's been wearing non-stop for a year. You get the idea.

Yet there are others who think the smell of freshly-cut durian is immensely pleasant, and are instantly drawn to the source of the stench (often up to 100 meters away, I've found), so that they can sample this incredible fruit for themselves as soon as possible. It takes all sorts, I suppose.

Smell is probably the sense we take most for granted, as we often don't even realize we're using it. Have you ever tried eating spicy food with a cold? You can't taste it. I remember as a child being forced to eat Brussel sprouts. I hated them; the only way I could bring myself to swallow them was to hold my nose as they went through. I have no idea how that worked, but it seemed to

Onto a far more pleasant olfactory sensation, anyway – flowers. Specifically, jasmine. Back in sunny England, I used to rely on one of those ludicrously-expensive plastic air fresheners

to bring a vague sense of normality to the usual pong of my car interior.

In Thailand, I just wind down the window at any reasonably-sized junction, and somebody will appear out of the blue to sell me a jasmine garland to hang from my rear view mirror. Ten baht buys a couple of days' relief. They're made mainly from two flowers – jasmine and michelia, or champaca.

Jasmine flowers emit an incredible smell – a bit like the perfume you'd imagine that Sophia Loren would wear. I once had about a dozen of these plants on a balcony in pots, and the smell that greeted me first thing in the morning was amazing.

Jasmine is a universally popular flower, especially in this corner of the globe, mainly due to that unique fragrance. The jasmine is native to tropical and warm regions of the old world. Jasmine flowers are white in most species, with some species bran-

dishing yellow flowers. Jasmine is believed to have originated in the Himalayas, in western China. Quite how anyone would claim that they know that is beyond me though.

Growing jasmine flowers doesn't exactly need the horticultural skills of Percy Thrower on steroids. Most jasmines grow well in moist, well drained, sandy to clayey soil (is "clayey" a word? I'm sure an English teacher will tell me). They prefer full sun to partial shade – they're sun worshipers.

They like gallons of water too (especially when they're younger), though don't let the soil get waterlogged. If they're in a pot, they will inevitably need to be re-potted every year or two to keep them from getting rootbound. Jasmine is also a very talented climber, and can be used to cover fences and walls.

Growth can be a bit sluggish to start with – they don't seem to be in any particular rush

to get going. Having said that, once they've got a bit of confidence there's no stopping them, so you might want to plant them a meter or two apart to try and stop them interfering with each other. As it were.

If you want to get serious, the tips of the plants at the top should be pinched fairly regularly, to stimulate sideways growth, and should get frequent attacks with the pruning shears. Also, with younger plants tie the wandering, reaching branches to the stem, to give it a bit of extra support. Kind of like the Playtex approach to gardening.

There is actually a true jasmine and a false jasmine; the two are commonly mistaken for each other because both plants release pretty impressive smells. The genuine jasmine belongs to the Oleaceae family, is primarily a bushy shrub or climbing vine, and is non-poisonous. This type of jasmine has oval, shiny leaves and tubular, waxy-white flowers. The impostor, the false jasmine, on the other hand, is in a completely different genus and family, and is thought to be too poisonous for human consumption.

Some people claim that the daily consumption of jasmine tea is effective in preventing certain types of rather nasty diseases. Many species of the plant, and the essential oil extracted from the flower are used extensively in cosmetics and perfume, and as a calmative (relaxing properties, sedative) and even as an aphrodisiac. There you go, gents.

Thankfully, should your better half ever pull the Dutch oven stunt on you, you can always sprint out to the car to retrieve one of those jasminy garlandy things to try and counteract the effects. Better still, munch on one and enjoy the night of unbridled passion that will inevitably ensue. Gentlemen, start your engines...

Krabi: on the edge of a boom

about to experience a boom in the property market. Out of curiosity I set out with a map, a small list of developments, and three days to find out more.

The search was not an easy one. Unlike Phuket, there are no offices of internationally affiliated property agents such as CBRE or Knight Frank, or any large local agencies.

First stop was Robert "Gus" Revnolds of Krabi Consulants. who, with 12 years in the area, proved to be a great resource.

Tourism is an excellent demand generator for property so I checked out two of the newest branded resorts in the area:

Central's Krabi Bay Resort, which has been open a year, and the newly opened Sofitel Phokeethra Resort.

Together with the Sheraton Krabi Beach Resort, which has been operating five years, these are the only brand-managed

properties in the area, as the longstanding, up-market Rayavadee, formerly a Dusit, is now independently operated.

According to General Managers of hotels in the area, annualized occupancies are now around 60%, with average room rates at upper-tier hotels surpassing similar products in Phuket.

While Ao Nang and Railey Beach are well established with the heaviest concentration of hotels in Krabi, Klong Muang and Tub Kaek are emerging with a number of up-market boutique hotels such as the Tub Kaak Resort and Nakamanda Resort & Spa.

There are also new entries opening this year, such as Phulay and the Vogue Pranang Bay Resort & Spa. The Phulay, designed by renowned Thai architect Lek Bunnag, is reputed to be in the same league as the Amanpuri and

Major investment in this area is with significant groups

y all reports, Krabi is such as MBK and Boon Rawd Brewery. Talking to hotel owners and managers, I heard two overriding themes. First is the desire to learn from Phuket's mistakes, which is evident in the underground power lines along the beachfront, the ban on jetskis and sun loungers on public beaches, and the emphasis on maintaining a natural environ-

> Second is the sense of pride you hear in discussions about assets that make Krabi a unique destination. Among them is the new airport. It's modern, well planned and in many ways superior to Phuket's. With direct international flights from Singapore on Tiger Airways, along with

> > THAI and a variety of low-cost carriers, the facility will significantly enhance demand for the destination.

Reviewing my list of property developments turned out to be no small task. Roads are not well marked; developers have yet to use directional signs;

and in most cases even projects underway do not have signs or sales offices.

In Klong Muang, Phulay Heights' 52 villas look out over Phang Nga Bay. On the beachfront at Nammao Bay, near Fossil Beach, is Amatapura with its 29 pool villas.

At Haad Yao (Long Beach) lies Krabi's most touted project: The Cove, where more than 1,000 rai is being developed to provide more than 1,200 residential condos and villas, branded hotels and an 18-hole Colin Montgomeriedesigned golf course.

With long stretches of beachfront and stunning views of distant islands, this is one of the Thailand's largest developments. Located nearby is Le Kiri, a boutique beachfront development of eight villas.

While there are a few smaller, mid-range projects in the 2-to-4 million-baht range focusing on buyers from Scandinavia and the UK, Krabi, in terms of

residential product, is where Phuket was 15 years ago.

But despite the limited product range and lack of international agents – although it is rumored that CBRE will open an office there soon – land in Krabi is not

Large lots of prime land were snapped up years ago, mainly by wholesale buyers from

Bangkok, so this may explain the lack of smaller developments. For golf courses, there is only the Pakasai Golf Club, which recently upgraded to 18 holes, and there are no major marinas to speak of.

Given the rise in tourism, hotels, and ease of access, Krabi appears to be on the cusp of great things. Property development will

most likely follow the branded hotels in Klong Muang and Tub Kaek and will evolve over time in the Haad Yao area simply because this is where the undeveloped land is.

Thalen Bay, with its proximity to the new five-star hotels and stunning views would seem a likely candidate for longer-term development.

It's going to be an interesting ride to see how Krabi's tourism visionaries stick to their plans and integrate with the property

In the meantime, if you head off to Krabi looking for real estate, take a good map and lots of patience and time. The market is pretty much a blank page at present, but that looks set to change rapidly in the very near future.
