# Gypsies protest for fishing rights

PHUKET CITY (Kom Chad Luek, Gazette): Some 100 sea gypsies from Rawai on February 7 petitioned Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit to help settle an ongoing, sometimes violent dispute over fishing rights near resorts.

The complaint follows sea gypsy Pratan Charncheow suffering decompression sickness after having his oxygen supply hose cut while diving off Nui Beach on December 31.

During that incident Pratan was fishing off the beach, about 2 kilometers south of Kata lookout point, with five other sea gypsies, including Alim Hadsaitong. They were diving for fish using a surface pump with attached air boses

K. Alim alleged that while three of them dived and the other three waited on the surface, a person from a nearby resort arrived on a jet-ski and cut K. Pratan's oxygen hose.

K. Pratan suffered decompression sickness following his rapid ascent to the surface for air.

He was taken to Vachira Phuket Hospital, where doctors ordered him not to dive for 30

The jet-ski driver also threatened to crash his jet-ski into other sea gypsies who fished there, K. Alim said.

A complaint of attempted murder was filed at Chalong Police Station on February 1, K. Alim said.

Fishing is the sea gypsies only livelihood, K. Alim told the Governor.

Since the province began promoting tourism, sea gypsy

villagers have been repeatedly threatened by hotel or resort owners, who attempt to prohibit them from fishing along beachfronts where resorts are lo-

"We think that we have the right to use our country's natural resources," said K. Alim, "yet many times we have been threatened by tourism business operators and then told we had to be patient.

"But this time it is too much. We can't accept it. We would like know why the province allows this situation to continue as it has, because we don't want to have any problems with anyone."

After hearing the com-

plaint, Gov Niran ordered Phuket Provincial Police Commander Maj Gen Decha Budnampetch and Muang District Chief Weerawat Janpen to investigate all of the allegations.

The Governor promised the villagers, generally referred to in the Thai press as Khon Thai Mai ("new Thai people") fairness in the investigation.

Chalong Police Superintendent Pol Col Chalit Kaewyarat identified the jet-ski driver as 30-year-old Chalothorn "Boy" Chotithanang, an employee of the resort at Nui Beach.

He was arrested and charged with attempted murder, then released on bail, Pol Col Chalit said.

### Patong hotel declared free of Legionnaires'

PHUKET: Breaking the silence regarding the reported outbreak of Legionnaires' disease at the hotel in January, Phuket Grand Tropicana General Manager Apichart Aha announced that the hotel has been declared free from the bacteria and that all water fixtures in the hotel have been cleaned thoroughly.

Dr Wiwat Sritamanod, of the Phuket Provincial Health Office, confirmed that the hotel had followed all necessary steps and that tests conducted on the hotel by the Bureau of Epidemiology (BE) show that it is free of the Legionnaires' bacteria.

To ensure there will be no further outbreaks the hotel sanitized equipment that uses water and will continue to monitor water quality, water temperature, the amount of chlorine in the water and the cooling systems used for the air conditioning.

A second hotel, which has not been named, is still undergoing tests, Dr Wiwat said, but it has implemented "quite strong measures" to kill the bacteria.

K. Apichart said that a Swedish expert on the bacteria visited the hotel and inspected the chlorine levels and water temperature.

"We now have an automatic pump to control the chlorine levels in the water," he said.

The PPHO and BE checked the water at the hotel four or five times until they were confident the bacteria was no longer present, Apichart said.

"The last report, from the Department of Health on January 27, shows that our hotel has followed the measures to manage and protect against future Legionnaires' outbreaks," he said.





### Gambling tops January arrests

PHUKET: From January 1 to 20, police arrested 208 people for gambling and 115 people for prostitution in Phuket, according to the latest crime statistics from the Phuket Provincial Police.

Cases involving ya bah (methamphetamine) totaled 99, with 108 arrests made and 5,681 pills seized.

Thirteen people were arrested for sniffing glue or paint thinners, 25 for possession of marijuana and three for possession of Ecstasy. Ten arrests involved krathom, with 103 leaves and six bottles of krathom-based intoxicant confiscated by police.

Eighty-five cases of theft were reported to the police, including nine stolen motorcycles. Arrests were made in 37 cases.

Ten arrests were made for possession of unlicensed firearms.

Four arrests were made in the seven cases of attempted murder reported. There were 13 reports of assault, with arrests made in nine cases.

Four rapes were reported, with three arrests made.

#### Local girl wins national contest

BANGKOK (Nation): Kathu Wittaya School student Waranya Nawaluck, 17, was awarded the National 3rd Annual Junior IMPAC Dublin Literary Award for Thailand on February 12.

The theme for the essay was "A Tale of Thai Grace and Compassion".

K. Waranya's essay revolves around her personal experience of the 2004 tsunami and the impact that the disaster had. One of the judges, Suchada Nimmanit, said the strength of Waranya's essay was her choice of words and the simple metaphors she employed.

As the national winner, Waranya will travel to Dublin accompanied by a parent where she will attend the Senior International IMPAC Dublin Literary Awards ceremony.

## OrBorJor to spend B160m on education

PHUKET: The Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) will spend 160 million baht of its 340-million-baht budget for fiscal 2007 on education, OrBorJor President Anchalee Vanich-Thepabutr has announced.

The dedication of nearly half the OrBorJor's annual budget follows seven schools transferring their administration organization from the central government to the OrBorJor.

Improvements in educational standards in the first four schools to transfer – Baan Maireab, Kathu Wittaya, Muang Phuket and Cherng Talay schools – were already evident, K. Anchalee said in a press release outlining only rough details of the budget.

Part of the education budget will be used to build an "Andaman Learning Center" at the Lucky Complex in Saphan Hin. Part of the long-abandoned building will be transformed into a science education center, complete with a planetarium and other attractions.

The OrBorJor will spend 56 million baht on tourism promotion, with a focus on "market development" in India, as the growing Indian middle classes have high spending power and tend to travel with their families or in large groups, K. Anchalee said.

In addition, OrBorJor employees will stage road shows and attend trade fairs around the world, including in Germany, England, Sweden, Denmark, Malaysia and

Part of the tourism-promotion budget will be spent on upgrading tourist attractions on Phuket and on improving the quality of services offered by tourism businesses.

Pipping tourism with some 60.6 million baht allocated was "quality of life development", which includes projects for the young, the elderly and the underprivileged.

Other areas of spending included 7.2 million baht on information technology projects, 28.7 million baht on administration development, 9.3 million baht on natural resource development and 18.2 million baht on infrastructure development.

## Fire destroys shops at Phi Phi Islands

PHI PHI DON: A fire raged through beachfront shops at the eastern end of Ton Sai Bay on Koh Phi Phi Don February 11, causing estimated damages of more than 2 million baht. No one was hurt in the blaze.

The fire began at a beer bar around 11:30 am and swiftly raged through 10 other shops. With freshwater supplies quickly depleted, hundreds of residents and tourists formed a line and passed buckets of seawater up the rocky beach to douse the flames.

It took about two hours to put out the fire, which was strengthened by gusts of wind.

Krabi Governor Siva Sirisaovalak later praised the tourists and everyone involved for their part in extinguishing the fire.

'Had they not joined hands, the damage could have been much more widespread," he said.

Phi Phi police chief Lt Col Jakra Saovakul said witnesses suggested a short circuit was the cause of the fire. He estimated the damage at 2 million baht, mostly in destroyed alcohol prod-

ucts, fishing gear and dry goods sold in the 10 shops.

Funds had already been allocated to the island's disaster prevention and mitigation center, he added.

Gov Siva said Phi Phi Don was overcrowded and should be re-planned to ensure emergency help could reach trouble spots more swiftly.

Tents and consumer goods

were brought in for the victims, one of whom described the damage to her shop as "just as devastating as the tsunami".

R/Adml Supot Pruksa, Commanding Officer of the Third Naval Area Command, ordered a Navy helicopter to fly in from its base at Phuket International Airport to conduct an aerial survey of the damage.

After two years of recovering from the 2004 tsunami, the two Phi Phi Islands have been attracting large numbers of tourists in recent months.

### Laborer killed by lover in drunken 'accident'

RASSADA: Banya Wosongkram, 20, from Khon Kaen died after being stabbed by his lover during a drinking session at a worker's camp near the bridge to Koh Sireh on January 31.

The incident occurred while he was drinking with two friends and his lover Siam Raisanguan, 32, a married woman from Kalasin province.

Lt Col Ampolwat Saengreuang of Phuket City Police Station said, "Banya was drinking with two friends. He called the woman over, saying that he didn't have any money for dinner.

"They were joking around about cheating and the man said 'if I've cheated on you then you can kill me'.

"Siam then grabbed a fruit knife lying nearby and jabbed at K. Banya with the 8½-inch blade. The knife went into his chest.

"The woman then pulled out the knife, causing the cut to bleed profusely, and screamed 'Don't die! Don't die! I was only joking!'. His friends took him to hospital, but he died on the way," Col Ampolwat said.


When police arrived, Siam was standing outside with blood on her hands. She did not know that K. Banya had died, he added.

Despite claiming that the stabbing was an accident, Siam was charged with murder, Col Ampolwat said.

# Addict gunned down after 4-hour standoff

PHUKET CITY: A four-hour standoff between police and a drug-crazed pork vendor ended violently February 7, with a policeman sustaining two bullet wounds before returning fire, hitting the gunman three times.

Phuket City Police Inspector Lt Col Umpolwat Sangrueng told the *Gazette* that about 5 am, Khamlah Thaninkunlaphat, wife of 39-year-old Chayakorn "Aod" Thaninkunlaphat, arrived at Phuket City Police Station to report that her husband was in a dangerous psychotic state, the result of his latest round of *ya bah* (methamphetamine) abuse.

She told police that her husband was enraged by her hiding his 9-mm pistol from him the day before out of fear he would shoot somebody.

As she was explaining the situation to police, K. Khamlah received a call on her mobile phone from a relative, who said that her husband had found the weapon and was running amok with it in their neighborhood off Mae Luan Rd.

Returning home, she found that Chayakorn had burned the inside of his pickup truck, which was still smoldering on a soi nearby. In front of the house was Chayakorn, sitting on a motorbike and holding his gun.

Demanding that everyone accompany him, Chayakorn said he was going to visit the grave of his father and paternal grandfather at the Chinese cemetery behind Surakul Stadium, not far from their home.

As Chayakorn stood by his father's grave near the road, police arrived. Seeing them, Chayakorn set fire to some high grass before fleeing to an uphill part of the cemetery some 200 meters from the road, firing warning shots and threatening to shoot anyone who approached.

About 9:45 am, one of Chayakorn's three daughters called him by mobile phone convinced him to come down.

During his descent, however, he came across Phuket City Police Crime Suppression Inspector Maj Pongnarin Suthin.

Chayakorn fired twice, hitting Maj Pongnarin in the shin and

calf before the officer returned fire, hitting Chayakorn twice in the stomach and once in the back, causing him to collapse to the ground.

Chayakorn attempted to shoot himself in the head, but when he pulled the trigger the gun did not fire, Col Umpolwat said

Chayakorn was rushed to Bangkok Hospital Phuket and Maj Pongnarin to Vachira Phuket Hospital.


At the time of going to press, both men remained in hospital and were listed as being in stable conditions, Col Umpolwat said.

Chayakorn's wife told police her husband had been a *ya* bah addict for about five years.

Col Umpolwat said that once Chayakorn had been released from the hospital, he would be charged with attempted murder of a government official.

A cousin of Chayakorn has also filed a complaint of attempted murder against Maj Pongnarin over the incident.

Police, however, are yet to take any action on the complaint.



## Aid for Southern temples

## Thai killed in Phang Nga mutiny

PHANG NGA: The captain of a Thai fishing boat, *Muang-Dam* 2, was seriously injured and his First Mate killed on February 9, when nine Burmese crew members mutinied about 40 miles off the coast of Phang Nga Province.

A tour boat found the captain of the boat, Chalermporn Phosung, floating adrift with serious stab wounds.

After the tour boat reported the incident to the Royal Thai Navy Third Naval Area Command at Cape Panwa, in Phuket, two Thai Navy vessels were sent to hunt for the mutineers.

About 4 pm, the Navy patrol boats sighted *Muang-Dam 2* west of the Similan Islands and ordered the vessel to stop.

The Burmese crew members, who were then in control of the boat, ignored the order.

The ship's mechanic, whose name was not released, managed to jump ship and was later rescued by another vessel.

The mutineers set the boat ablaze and then abandoned ship.

The Navy detained two of the men, who were later handed over to police.

The fate of the other seven remains unknown, a source at the

Third Naval Area Command told the *Gazette*.

The mutiny was incited by Burmese crew members taking offense at being scolded by the captain, the source explained.

Capt Chalermporn was taken to Takuapa Hospital, in Phang Nga province, to be treated for stab wounds to his left ear, right arm and chest.

Muang-Dam 2 belonged to Wanchai Maleemongkol from Samut Prakan.





#### Tired of the comeand-go charities appearing and disappearing after the 2004 tsunami, Philipp Graf von Hardenberg decided to create a project with lasting impact and a chance to break the poverty cycle for poor children and orphans in Phang Nga. His solution? A boarding school that teaches life and business skills through hands-on education, while retaining traditional Thai values and a family setting. The Gazette's Semacote Suganya reports on the Yaowawit School in Kapong.

The 2004 tsunami brought aid agencies, missionaries, and a slew of foreigners to the devastated Baan Nam Khem coastline of southern Thailand. Many have come and gone, but the founders of the Yaowawit School in Kapong built a project to stay.

Originally a response to the tragedy wrought by the tsunami, the school project found a need for quality education and a boarding school setting for the area's orphans and poorest children.

"I started the project because I saw a lot of big organizations coming in, helping for one day, then they left to the next village. A lot of children were very sad because they got used to one person who soon left, so I decided to make a project that would stay

for the long-term," said Philipp Graf von Hardenberg, founder of the Yaowawit School and of the Children's World Academy Foundation (CWAF) based in Hamburg, Germany.

The CWAF sponsored the Yaowawit School to provide a comprehensive approach to the needs of the children in the area. Though a boarding school, an oncampus home and family-style setting is provided for the students. The youngest children live in a family home on the school's

campus. When they reach the age of six, they move to the boarding dormitories, which are also designed to be family-oriented with a live-in teacher or tutor. Each dorm has four bedrooms with four children each. The children look after their living areas themselves as would be expected in a normal home.

"Poor people cannot afford a good education so they stay poor. It is the same way in Germany, America, and all over the world. Our idea is to break this pattern with education," Mr Graf von Hardenberg told the *Gazette*.

"The program here starts with the standard Thai curriculum, but we want to teach the children skills so they can be self-sufficient when they leave. We will teach them about hospitality and tourism – a big business in Thailand – organic farming, Thai herbal medicine and much more. We already have an organic garden and a fish pond," said cofounder William Gaynor.


The project chose the com-

munity of Kapong, about 30 minutes inland from Baan Nam Khem, as its location, hoping it would alleviate fears of the children and staff of being too near the sea.

While the school is not yet completed and at this time enrolls children only through grade six (about 12 years old), vocational programs will be added as the school grows.

School Director Man Sooksawee reported that, "all our funds came from donations. We now have two classrooms for kindergarten and six for the primary school. We serve a total of 80 children. Next year we plan to add 15 more children to the kindergarten program. The next phase of construction will include a computer room, art room, and a guest house for volunteers and visitors."

The official opening ceremony was held on April 24,







2006, with a visit from HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn. At that time, the school had about 40 children.

The long-term goal of the school is to eventually provide for up to 180 boarding students and an additional 40 to 50 from the surrounding community, reports school Family Manager Chatkwae Nanthapanij.

Yaowawit School also intends to develop a system of "learning centers", which will include an Eco-Farming Center; a Tourism and Hotel School, with a restaurant and 24-room hotel on the school grounds beginning in late 2007; a Health and Nutrition Center, based in the restaurant where students will learn about nutrition and how to cook; a Body and Soul Center where they will be taught about fitness and mental health; a center for Traditional Culture and Modern Art; and an internet-enabled Global Communication Center, to provide language instruction in Thai, English and other languages.

An essential part of the school's educational philosophy is real-world experience for the stu-

dents in the subjects they are studying. This is achieved by activities such as fishing with an experienced fisherman and business professionals visiting the school. Staff from Bangkok Phuket Hospital, for example, have visited the school to teach about nutrition and to help train the teachers.

Yaowawit School also typically has two to five in-residence volunteers from other countries whoo assist with instruction and help expose the children to other cultures.

The idea, Mr Graf von Hardenberg said, "is to give the children all the education they want, so when they leave here they will have an opportunity to get the job they want, or go to the university they want, or do anything they want to do with their lives".

As building and operating the school will be expensive, the school has numerous projects planned to help with its ongoing operational expenses, above and beyond what the original donors have contributed. It is expected that the hotel training program will

generate income from the guest rooms, as well as from the restaurant. The farming project is also expected to generate some income.

Once completed, the entire project is expected to cost about 86 million baht. That price includes all buildings but not the operating costs.

Mr Graf von Hardenberg said that local materials were built into the design of the buildings to keep costs down. That idea caught the interest of a UNICEF project designer who came to the school to see for himself - and now uses the concepts developed at that Yaowawat School in his own designs.

"At the beginning people thought that we were missionaries and didn't know what we wanted from them. Now they know us and trust us," reports Mr Graf von Hardenberg.

"I really think that people are learning that we are one world and that we have to take care of each other. At the Yaowawit School we try to make a small bit of difference in this world."

# Centipede on steroids

RAWAI: Villagers in Rawai were dumbfounded when a huge centipede, reportedly half a meter in length, was spotted near a public waterhole in Village 2.

At 1 pm on February 6, villagers in the area of Baan Thai Mai (New Thais Village, or "Sea Gypsy" village) on Wiset Rd were seen crowding around a 20-meter-tall sugar palm tree. All were excitedly trying to catch a glimpse of an enormous centipede reportedly hiding out high up in the tree's canopy.

Some villagers were throwing rocks at the tree, hoping to force the arthropod to come down and make an appearance. Others stood ready with cameras, hoping to capture an image of the creature as a souvenir.

One villager, identified only as Rawee, 45, said he was the first one to spot the centipede the day before.

He and four other friends were bathing in the public waterhole when he saw the enormous centipede crawl down the tree and dip itself in the water before crawling back up to the safety of the tree's upper reaches.

He described the centipede as reddish-brown in color, about 50 centimeters in length and with a girth similar to that of a human arm.

Rawee and his bathing buddies were astonished by the size of the centipede because they had never seen anything like it, he said.

After the initial shock wore off, he screamed out to other villagers in the area about the centipede. All who saw it agreed that it was, in truth, a very large specimen. Word of the discovery soon became the talk of the *tambon*, with people from near and far hoping to catch a glimpse of the hundred-legged invertebrate.

The sheer size of the creature, if correctly reported, is significant because the largest known species of centipede, the Amazonian giant centipede, reportedly maxes out at about 30 centimeters in length. The Vietnamese centipede, which matches the color description given by K. Rawee, only reaches about 20 centimeters in length.

At last report, residents of the area were planning a mission to scale the sugar palm in an effort to catch a better view of the centipede – or even capture it and put it on display for all to see.

Surprisingly in a case such as this, there were no reports of people trying to divine winning lottery numbers from aspects of the creatures physiology.

The price is five baht, 12 baht with a special collector's envelope. A million copies are to be printed.



# ccording to the Acting Director of Samui's prison, Weerayut Kalasri, foreign convicts account for 54% of inmates in the island's 181-million-baht facility.

Most of the foreign prisoners are Burmese, sentenced for crimes such as drug dealing, murder and rape, he said.

The remainder includes Cambodians, Laotians and Nepalese, many convicted for petty crimes.

There is also a handful of European inmates serving sentences for drugs and fraud offenses

According to prison staff, many people from neighboring countries end up in prison on Samui for minor offenses. This, they say, is because local people are more likely to press charges against foreigners than they are their fellow countrymen.

One example is a recent case involving Kam Oo, a Laotian woman with a four-monthold baby who was convicted for stealing a pork chop from a Tesco-Lotus Superstore and is now being held, with her child, in the island's jail.

Kam Oo resorted to theft after her husband, having brought her to the island, disappeared and left her penniless with a small child to look after.

Despite this, managers at the superstore chose to press charges and the police were obliged to make an arrest.

Many Thai prisons lack facilities for inmates with children, so the task of providing baby supplies and offering assistance with child-rearing generally falls on the wardens.

Many of them volunteer their time for the sake of the children, which adds considerably to the workload.

With so many economic migrants arriving on Samui to find work, instances of petty crime are on the increase. Many believe a



**Scammers:** A gang masquerading as reporters from a Thai daily newspaper recently fooled a number of prominent business


people and public officials on Samui into paying for bogus tickets to a charity talk show at a local school.

The authorities then alerted the police, who soon discovered that the gang was operating out of Haad Yai and had taken money from people for similar bogus events in the past. The whereabouts of the culprits remain unknown.

cting on a tip-off, police in Songkhla discovered the internal vault of a stolen Krung Thai Bank ATM buried in a forest in Chana District. The machine had been stolen from Haad Yai on January 24.

The 100-strong search team, which set out at 8 am February 4, was led by Pol Lt Gen Adul Saengsingkaew, Assistant Commissioner General of the Royal Thai Police and Acting Police Region 9 Commissioner.

Next to a coconut plantation in the specified area, officers found a circular patch of soil about two meters in radius that looked as if it had been recently covered over. Digging at a depth of about one meter, officers discovered the vault. It had been opened with a blowtorch and the 2.4 million baht it had once contained was missing.

Police have arrested two suspects in connection with the case. Phakdee Chalee, the coconut plantation guard, admitted to knowing that the ATM safe was buried there, but denied any involvement in the robbery. K. Phakdee, 45, claimed that the sixmember gang that stole the machine had turned up and demanded to use a shack on the plantation.

Police also arrested Loh Ketmasuriya, 48, in a nearby

house, and seized two shotguns and two safety helmets matching those worn by the robbers. Loh denied any knowledge of the robbery.

**Godfather Jr:** Surat Thani Police on February 5 arrested a 17-year-old on suspicion of "countless" muggings, including the robbery and shooting of a Marine Police Officer.

The youth was arrested at 10 am in Surat Thani City after he was caught snatching gold jewelry at about 1 am the same day.

Under questioning, the suspect also confessed to the shooting of Pol Sen Sgt Maj Somsak Suwanla-ong, who was stationed at Marine Police Region 6 Command in Surat Thani. Sen Sgt Maj Somsak was seriously injured after being shot with a sawed-off shotgun during a robbery last year.

Pol Col Atthapol Plengwithaya, Superintendent of Surat Thani Muang District Police Sta-



tion, said that the young suspect was the leader of a mafia-style gang, with many followers who

have committed numerous crimes. Police know the identities of the other gang members and are now in the process of rounding them up, Col Atthapol added.

Security barrier to be extend-

ed: The government will extend a security barrier along the Thailand-Malaysia border in an effort to curtail the insurgency in the South and prevent illegal workers entering the country from Malaysia, Prime Minister Surayud Chulanont said on February 4, the final day of a four-day visit to the region.

A three-kilometer divide currently separates part of Sadao District in Songkhla from Malaysia's Perlis State. The government would extend the fence 27 kilometers into Yala, PM Surayud said.

**Health-care crisis:** Continuing violence in the Deep South has reduced residents' access to health-care and led to Narathiwat leading the country in cases of elephantiasis, with 118 cases.

Public Health Minister Mongkol na Songkhla said all residents of villages with elephantiasis cases had to take medication every year as a preventive measure against the mosquito-borne disease. The incidence of elephantiasis in Narathiwat was 33 cases per 100,000 people – 11 times higher than the national rate.

All 78,000 residents of 19 affected Narathiwat villages received medicine in 2005, but as violence flared into almost daily attacks last year, only 35,000 villagers received the medicine, he said.

"We have drawn up a fiveyear plan to ensure that the medicines reach all local people," Dr Mongkol said.

He also expressed concern about the fact that many children in Narathiwat were underweight.


Knowledge Park opens: HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn inaugurated a new Thailand Knowledge Park (TK Park) on February 6 in Yala.

Modeled after Bangkok's TK Park, the southern branch incorporates local touches such as rubber-wood decor and a Muslim prayer room.

In its month-long soft opening, TK Park has attracted more than 10,000 visitors.

The Yala branch has about 10,000 books and journals and games with Thai content, and a database covering southern music and songs, plus 200 books about the South.

## Election rules face big changes

nder the new Constitution, party-list MPs and single-MP constituency elections will be scrapped, Drafting Subcommittee Chairman Charan Pakdithanakul has announced.

The main reason for scrapping the party-list MPs is because the system allows capitalists to rise to power through money politics, he said.

The subcommittee decided to maintain the number of constituency MPs at 400, fearing that politicians may oppose the new constitution if it reduces the num-

They also ruled to scrap the single-MP constituency system to make way for a multiple-MP system, in which each constituency will be larger and MP candidates who win the most votes respectively are elected in each province, K. Charan said.

Vote counting will be changed to curb electoral fraud by ballots being changed on the way to the center; the new method will also prevent canvassers from being able to check if voters vote for the candidate they want, he said.

The subcommittee also ruled against political parties merging during the tenure of an administration and banned exit polls on Election Day.

Lotteries to continue: The controversial two- and three-digit lottery will continue, even if the Council of State decides the Thaksin government had no legal position to launch it, Finance Minister Pridiyathorn Devakula

He added that he had not received the council's legal interpretation.

"I need to read that first, then I'll find a way to continue operating the lottery. I have plenty of options," he said.

The Prime Minister's Office Minister, Prasith Kowilaikul. confirmed it was K. Pridiyathorn's decision whether to continue operating the lottery.

**Gang green:** A public hearing on future energy production was called off after a mob of about 300 angry protesters from Prachuap Khiri Khan obstructed the entrance to the Siam City Hotel in Bangkok, where the event was to be held.

"You build, we burn," shouted the protesters, who insisted the government drop its 15year draft energy plan, which includes a proposal for nuclear power plants. The hotel asked the organizers to cancel the meeting, because the protesters were frightening guests.

**Energy Policy and Planning** Office Director-General Viraphol Jirapraditkul said the hearing would be re-scheduled.

Tragic bus: An elderly woman was reunited with her family 25 years after taking a wrong bus that led her into a life of poverty and confinement.

Twenty-five years ago, Narathiwat resident Jaeyaena Beuraheng, now 76, thought she was boarding a bus bound for Narathiwat from Malaysia.

Not being able to read, write or speak Thai, the Malay-speaking woman and mother of eight did not know the bus was headed for Bangkok.

She tried to get back to the South from the capital, but compounded her crisis by taking a bus to Chiang Mai. There she spent five years begging until she was arrested and placed in a social service center in Phitsanuloke.

K. Jaeyaena's identity was discovered earlier this month by three students from Narathiwat who happened to be working at the center.

For years, staff at the center had assumed K. Jaeyaena was either Mon or Shan. The three Narathiwat women were the first ones there who had ever been able to fully communicate with her.


Medical breakthrough: Chiang Mai University has created the world's first easy-to-use strip test to measure blood levels of Nevirapine, a widely-used HIV/Aids treatment.

Each test costs just 100 baht and can accurately measure Nevirapine levels within 10 min-

n a kingdom world-famous for its scenic beaches and historic sites, Wat Chalong stands out as one of the most historically significant temples in the south of Thailand.

Although its origins are hard to pin down, it was well-known to King Rama V, who renamed it "Wat Chaitararam". The new name never gained common acceptance, however.

Wat Chalong has had many abbots, but the first recorded one was Poh Tan Tao. His successor, Luang Poh Chaem, was the most famous abbot, known for being a protector of the people.

The Wat Chalong Annual Fair is a large and time-honored event on Phuket, but few are aware of its origins.

Chalong resident Chaiwat Chatchawet, somewhat of an expert on Wat Chalong, volunteered some information on the subject of the Chalong Temple Fair, which this year runs from February 16 to 22.

"Nobody knows exactly when it started, but my forebears told me that they celebrated the festival since birth.

"This fair started...because there used to be many Chinese who lived here for the tin mines. When the Chinese New Year arrived early in the year, they did not have anywhere to go to relax except the temple.

"It is the Chinese New Year tradition that after they pay respect to their ancestors, they go out to celebrate with family," said K. Chaiwat, age 54.

"The fair kept growing along with the community around it. I can remember helping out in the temple as a child by bringing the sand used to create a miniature pagoda (a merit-making practice also performed at Thai New Year, or Songkran Day) and listening to the monks chanting.

"It's just in the last three years that we have restored this

tradition [of sand pagodas] in order to preserve it for the younger generation. In the past, the area near Wat Chalong was intersected with canals – there was an abundance of sand, so we didn't need to buy it as we do today.


"The fair is seven days and seven nights long, with many diversions, lots of food and other local products. As for amusements that involve gambling or anything considered obscene, the Religious Affairs Department has issued a warning to the temple committee, so this year there won't be anything like that.

"Wat Chalong hosts the annual fair, while other organizations, such as the Tambon Rawai Administration Organization and Phuket Provincial Administration Organization give their support. The temple controls the budget... the annual budget for the fair is at least a million baht.

"Many people contribute toward the fair, and any funds raised by it go toward social causes, such as for Phuket Muang School, Vachira Phuket

Hospital and donations to flood victims.

"I don't worry about the en-



If you're driving, Wat Chalong is about eight kilometers from Phuket City on Chao Fa West Rd (Route 4021), on the left before Chalong Circle.







F-F-FAST: The new 599 GTB Fiorano is screamingly fast, achieving 0-100kmh in under four seconds, and costs a mere 9 million baht – plus tax.

here are few cars that can best the front-engined Ferrari 575 Maranello, which has proved to be a race winner as well as a production success.

One of these is the car that replaces the Maranello – the new Ferrari 599 GTB Fiorano.

The 599 GTB is now on sale and it is absolutely stunning. It is also the fastest production Ferrari ever built (the magnificent Enzo supercar is considered to be a limited edition model) with a maximum speed of more than 330kmh and a 0-100kmh sprint time significantly under four seconds.

The price for all this power? A reported US\$255,000, or just a tad under 9 million baht – before tax.

The engine is a revised sixliter, 48-valve V12 from the Enzo. Power output peaks at 620bhp (456kW) at 7,600rpm, while the immense torque of the unit tops 608Nm at the relatively high engine speed of 5,600rpm, but such is the pulling power of the big V12 that it will happily motor along at little more than idle-speed RPMs.

The Magneti Marelli electro-hydraulic F1 shift system changes ratios in around 100 milliseconds – only a fraction slower than a Formula 1 car.

The interior of a new car often says a great deal about the care and attention that has been put into the overall design and the new 599 GTB is simply an exquisite example.

Acres of carbon fiber and leather, the glorious sound of that V12 only inches from your feet, and the highest of high-tech gadgets you could imagine.

A balance has been struck in the interior between the car's sporting aspirations and the inti-



macy that only hand-crafting and personalization can achieve.

The passenger area of the cabin is trimmed in sumptuous leather, while the driver's cockpit boasts high-tech detailing in carbon fiber and aluminum.

The seats are also a mix of carbon fiber and leather and are

supremely comfortable, gripping their occupants tightly under hard cornering. For the passenger there is a central grab handle to provide extra support.

An engine start button is mounted on the leather steering wheel, together with the electronic selector that controls many aspects of the car, including the differential and shift points for the transmission. The highest advisable setting is "Race"; there is one more click, which turns off every electronic aid, leaving the driver to fend for himself.

The tachometer is centrally-mounted in the instrument binnacle in front of the driver and is red-lined at 8,400rpm. To the right is the speedometer, which reads to 360kmh, while to the left of the tacho is a digital readout that provides the driver with full information on oil and water temperature and other essential facts.

Lengthy testing in the Ferrari wind tunnel has resulted in a drag coefficient of just 0.336, a remarkable feat considering the necessary downforce required for a car that can exceed 330kmh.

The suction created under the 599 GTB is now far greater than the lift generated by the upper bodywork. The flying-buttresses on either side of the wraparound rear window help channel the air without increasing drag.


The Fiorano is the latest in a line of great Ferrari models and is named after the Ferrari-owned circuit used to hone the performance of its race and road cars.

Customers can also experience circuit driving, courtesy of Ferrari, particularly if they elect to pick up their new car from Maranello.

The designation GTB is in honor of the most famous Berlinettas ever built, while the number 599 reflects the displacement of the superb 620bhp V12 engine.

#### here's a well-known Thai expression that goes, "School is a child's second home, his teachers his second parents."

This saying illustrates the important role teachers play in Thai society in developing children to be future leaders and respectable individuals. Some 50 years ago, the Ministry of Education (MoE) dedicated January 16 as Teacher's Day to praise, encourage and recognize teachers' efforts.

This year, the Phuket Governor's Office awarded the 38 Outstanding Teacher Awards: 28 to classroom teachers and 10 to school administrators, many of whom have a decade or more of experience in the classroom.

One Outstanding Teacher award recipient in the administration category was 58-year-old Phuket native Kham Sukhapan, who has been working as a teacher for 35 years and is now Director of Kathu Wittaya School.

"Being a teacher involves not only giving the students knowledge, but also teaching them about life's realities," said Ajarn Kham.

It may come as little surprise that Ajarn Kham chose the teaching profession, as his father was Phuket's Deputy Education Chief when Kham was a boy growing up on Mae Luan Rd in Phuket City.

Kham was a good boy growing up and wanted to please his parents, so he worked and studied hard to be a teacher – as they hoped he would – while his six siblings all pursued careers in different fields.

Ajarn Kham started his education at Anuban Phuket School and then continued to primary

Because teachers are such an important part of every child's upbringing, Thailand sets aside one day each year to honor its teachers, with each province awarding its best educators with highly-coveted Outstanding Teacher awards. One of this year's recipients was Kham Sukhapan of Kathu Wittaya School. Here he tells the Gazette's Janyaporn Morel what he's learned from his 35-year teaching career

school at Tessabaan Pluk Panya School.

He graduated secondary school from Phuket Wittayalai School and was then admitted to the two-year teacher's course at Nakhon Sri Thammarat Teacher's College, now Rajabhat Nakhon Sri Thammarat University.

He then moved to the capital, studying at Suan Sunanta Teacher's College in Bangkok for gree from Wittayalai Wichakarnsuksa, now Srinakharinwirot University's Prasarnmitr Campus in Bangkok.

After he graduated at age 23, Kham's teaching career began with a job at Phuket Wittayalai School earning the princely salary of 1,250 baht a month.

In 1990 Ajarn Kham was promoted to Deputy Director of Phuket Wittayalai and then accepted a position as Headmaster at Veerasattri Anusorn School in Pa Khlok. There he stayed until he became School Director in

"I have been Director for Kathu Wittaya School since April 2004. When I started in school management I had to learn more about the other fields of education so that I could give good advice to the entire teaching staff. I think that is why schools under my management have continually developed and won many awards," he said.

Kathu Wittaya is a large school, with 1,020 students studying in Mattayom (secondary level) M1 to M6. Almost all of the students are from Kathu District, though there are a few from Muang and Thalang Districts as

under the former government's "One District, One Dream School" program in January

"For the Outstanding Teacher award, teachers were required to submit a summary of their work from 2003 until 2007 to a judging committee.

"This was the first year that the winners were selected this way, considering their contributions both to school and society. I'm the first director of Kathu Wittaya School to receive such an award," he said.

The award is not Ajarn Kham's first teaching award, however. He was awarded Thailand's Best Teacher Award (Khuru Sadudee) in October

"My wife and I have never told our daughters what we want them to do with their lives. They are free to choose their own course – as long as they are good people," he said.

As for the challenges facing children growing up in the new millennium, he said, "Thai children now are getting great advantages from new technology, unlike children in the past. The world now is wide open. Although the new technology is good, we have to make sure we use it the right way, too. My biggest concern for Thai children is they are becoming too materialistic. There seems to have been a change in social values that has resulted in many children becoming conceited and self-centered. I think we really need to take extra care with how we raise children in this day and age," he said.

"The most important thing for us now is to teach students how to be good, strong members of society. We have to accept that the world is constantly changing and we must work hard, using our experience to teach children how to protect themselves from vices," he said.


"I'd like children to be smart, happy and productive members of society. Of course it all depends on a child's own capabilities and wishes, but if our students go on to be successful in life, that is enough for teachers," he concluded.

## Surviving without the Internet

nternet addicts living in Phuket are all too familiar with their beloved web being slow, or even worse, completely out of service.

But the devastation caused to Internet lines by the Taiwan earthquake shortly before New Year's Day left millions of people across Asia cut off from email and websites for days. Even now, connections across the region are sluggish.

In a world where highspeed connections have been taken for granted, the event has forced us to face up to the reality of what life without the Internet would be like, and in many cases exposed our inability to cope.

It is hard to imagine we ever lived without Google searches, eBay auctions, online shopping and Skype – but in reality, it is only a matter of a few years since we somehow managed to struggle from one day to the next without ever logging on.

In those seemingly far-off days, things were still bought and sold, families were still fed, public transport still worked, businesses still made profits and social events were still successfully organized and executed – all without the Internet. It's just that we had to do things differently.

Charles Mok, head of the Hong Kong Internet Society, said the Internet disruption caused by the earthquake should serve as a "wake-up call".

"There are people who should think about whether they can plan their life in a different way," he said.



WRITE A LETTER??? The experts say that many people find it easier to express emotions on paper, and the recipient will generally treasure a letter far more than an email.

"If for some reason they can't use the Internet for a period of time and they just sit there complaining, maybe there are other things they should think about doing

"This earthquake ought to make them realize there are other things to do in life than going on the Internet. They should really find a better balance. Just like other things in life, at some point you might unexpectedly lose it—and you really have to cope with it."

Experts say there is no knowing when the next Internet blackout will occur. So to help

prepare for the next time Asia is cut off from the outside world by a natural disaster that severs our Internet connections, here are seven things you can do to remain sane when the computers are down.

**Pick up a phone:** Put a voice to the names of email business contacts you have known for years but have never met or spoken to by phoning.

An even more radical approach would be to arrange a face-to-face meeting over coffee. Hearing a voice or seeing a face is a great way to build confidence and trust that can only benefit your business or career.

**Use your legs:** The world of instant messaging and email has created workplaces in which noone speaks to each other – where orders, reports, requests are sent via the Internet.

This may save you time, but the consequences can also be bad for your health.

Try instead using your legs, get up from your chair, take a walk around the office and talk to your colleagues.

In addition to building relationships, both social and work, those extra steps and rest peri-

ods away from your desk will burn calories, rest tired eyes and stretch muscles and avoid strain which in the long term can result in bad backs, eye strain and repetitive-task-related injuries

**Go to the library:** An online search may be fast and effortless, but there is nothing like a reference library to make you really appreciate the world of knowledge.

Surround yourself with books and get a taste of what it was like to engross yourself in research before the Internet. The process is far more challenging and rewarding.

Write a letter: If you want to say something and can't do it in person, there is no better way than a letter. A good letter will be kept for years.

Psychologist Dr Lisa Matthewman, of the University of Westminster in the UK, says many people find it easier to express their emotions on paper.

Despite being considered old fashioned, letters are more appreciated by the recipient, she says.

"It is a very warm gesture and women in particular appreciate them." Rediscover the art of conversation: Use the Internet-free time and time away from chat rooms and game sites to talk and play with your children, or even just to have a family meal together.

Resurrect old board games, go to the movie, go for a walk, or rediscover your old CD collection and enjoy some quality time with your family.

**Go shopping:** With Internet shopping becoming more popular, there may come a day when only weirdos go the mall.

Make the most of window shopping rather than browsing, go try on clothes, pick up, flick through and feel the weight of a book before buying, handle real cash or simply wander around a wet market taking in the sights, sounds and smells. Buy a pen to write letters with.

One day this may be all a thing of the past. Take the Taiwan breakdown as a warning and savor the experience now.

**Enjoy the freedom:** It is a well known fact most of us are slaves to the Internet.

A survey last year commissioned by Hewlett-Packard claimed office workers spent an average of four hours a day talking to friends online and messaging – more time than they spent actually working.

Researchers found workers showed a total lack of discipline in handling emails, unable to resist the temptation to answer immediately – even thinking it was acceptable to answer during meetings or conferences – with the effect that they were having to constantly change direction. As a result their brain slowed down.

Health writer Jane Alexander, author of *The Overload Solution*, says the consequence is a constant state of alert for emails, causing what she terms "overload", a condition resulting from having too many demands pressing on you at the same time.

So use the current Internet slowdown as an excuse to free yourselves from the computer at least for a few days, and enjoy the extra time on your hands.

Mr Look also keeps a careful eye on his stores; he came to the Patong Chartage to organize the shop and arrange the displays himself, she said.


"His concept is based on the change of seasons. For Thailand, he adapted the designs according to Thai seasons. He inspects the shop once or twice every month," K. Bee explained.

ust hearing the word "spa" makes me feel more relaxed. But when I hear that the spa I am next to visit is the award-winning Le Spa at Le Meridien Khao Lak Beach & Spa Resort, I start to think that those awards must be deserved.

A quick jaunt over the hill to Patong can be harrowing enough, but the 120-kilometer drive north from Phuket City and over the Lamru National Park range, although gorgeous it is, would be just cause for some of the best relaxation therapy in the region.

Le Spa was recently awarded the coveted titles of Thailand's Leading Spa Resort and Asia's Leading Spa Resort at the World Travel Awards 2006, a highly regarded event in the global tourism community.

Le Spa is the highlight of the resort, with eight private treatment villas surrounded by lush tropical gardens. I start my visit at the spa's reception building, which is separate from the treatment villas in order to maximize privacy for guests.

Spa Manager Sinee Tongwijit, who has more than 10 years of spa experience, meets me in the spa's reading room, which has views of the green gardens around the spa.

K. Sinee explains that the spa is the second most profitable area of hotel, after rooms, and that the outstanding aspect of the spa is the relationship between the therapists – the spa has 18 thera-

pists and a beautician – and the guests.

About 25% of the hotel's guests use the spa, and about 70% of Le Spa's guests are return guests, she adds.

As we leave the reception building we pass the foot massage area. K. Sinee says that the massages are the

most popular treatments in the spa, preferred even over scrubs and beauty treatments.

The spa menu is changed every year. The shortest treatment on the current menu is a 30minute bath treatment for 950

The longest treatment is the six-hour Wonderful Day package for 8,625 baht, which includes

herbal steam treatment, a floral bath, Swedish massage, manicure and pedicure, body scrub, body wrap and a facial treatment.

K. Sinee took me on a tour of Le Spa's eight villas, connected by paths lined with plants and water features.

Khao Lak Each villa comprises a large, doublebed room that is luxuriously decorated, with the curtains and lighting creating an elegant ambiance. Around the main room are small, connected water features that together add to the relaxing feeling.

> Every spa villa has a large sauna and a shower room, as well as a comfy sofa and a safe to place valuables in, and a private outside area where guests can receive treatment.



K. Sinee suggests I take a five-treatment package that starts with a 30-minute Aromatic Steam Bath (950 baht), followed by the one-hour Asian Herbal Exfoliation (1,850 baht), 30-minute Floral Bath (950 baht), one-hour warm stone massage (2,300 baht) and ending with the one-hour Nature's Balancing Facial (1,750 baht).

Before the floral bath I enjoy some time in the villa's private sauna, which is at the ideal temperature for after a shower. I then spend 30 minutes in a bath imbued with red rose petals. The smell of roses is sweet and I feel like I am in a rose garden.

Next is a one-hour scrub using a cream made from tanaka and sandalwood, which exfoliates unwanted skin, improves blood circulation and refreshes skin. After the scrub I take another shower before my massage.

About 40 black, Indonesian stones are used for the one-hour warm stone massage. Usually I'm scared of things hot but Pornphan "Koy" Tongluang, my therapist, put my mind at ease.

The stones are just warm – not hot – and they will help my blood circulation.

I lay on a warm towel while K. Koy massages me with the stones instead of her hands. The stones are heated by being kept in warm water, and K. Koy constantly changes them to keep them warm.

I find I like the warm stone massage better than a massage by hand, and the next day I did not feel any soreness in my muscles.

My final treatment is Nature's Balancing Facial, which includes a facial cleansing, scrub and facial mask.

Before I know it, I've spent almost half a day at the spa, and the visit is well worth the drive home.

t is most extraordinary, and one of the greatest mysteries of life in Phuket. It's probably not the only holiday resort where this phenomenon takes place, but here we live with it every day.

Mr and Mrs Smith have spent a lifetime working hard, bringing up a family, getting their comfortable home paid off, getting a new car, waiting for a new grandchild.

Although they are possibly a little overweight, they generally consider themselves to be in the prime of their lives and enjoy the fact that they can afford to travel the world.

So they now decide to risk everything – including their own lives – by renting a Honda Dream motorcycle and wobbling off over the hills to fulfill their dream of fun and freedom, oblivious to the fact that they are highly likely to find themselves spending the rest of their vacation in a hospital bed with arms and legs suspended from the ceiling; or worse still, getting themselves splattered all over the road like the proverbial "moggy" by an out-of-control concrete truck or tour bus.

as they cheat death by inches and seconds, missing potholes by centimeters that would cause them to fall off under the By Graham Doven wheels of a truck

coming the other way. It's probably unlikely that they would remotely consider being seen down in the shopping center at home on a Honda Dream. Their friends



and neighbors would think they'd gone bit potty, a tinny short of a six pack, if you know what I mean.

Apart from the horrifying I follow them day after day dangers of this foolhardy way of

getting around, it's not exactly comfortable. The strain of keeping the bike upright while avoiding trucks, buses and other crazy motorcy-

clists, the bumps, the burns on the leg from the hot exhaust, the hot sun and wind somehow all manage to create a delusional sense of fun.

When reality strikes with a bang, this form of recreation often ends up with a stay in Vachira Phuket Hospital's intensive care unit. Of the 80-odd beds in that unit, I would guess that at any given time 70 are motorbike accidents, many with fractured

Outside it's like a MASH hospital during wartime, especially on Friday night or at the start of a holiday weekend: 20 or 30 trolleys waiting for the incoming wounded. There are two or three outside another door to take away those who don't make it.

The roads on this island are deadly. It requires great care and attention to drive these roads in the relative security of our pickup trucks or cars. Two large adults getting on a small motorcycle who don't know the roads on Phuket or understand the dangers – and probably rarely or never get on a motorcycle at home – would probably be better off taking a relaxing holiday in Baghdad. The chances of them going home in a body bag would be less.

Phuket is not a tropical island with just a few dirt tracks between the beaches and bungalows. It is a big province with heavy traffic – and probably with more dangerous roads than any

big city. Would you ride the Honda Dream around Paris or Rome or Bangkok? If you want to get around independently, hire a car. Don't throw away your life to save a few dollars.

On that note and speaking of moggies, an old English expression for a cat, I recall a song that a friend of mine used to sing in Australia:

Somebody's Moggy by the side of the road

Somebody's pussy who forgot his highway code

Someone's favorite feline who ran clean out of luck

When he ran onto the road and tried to argue with a truck.

Yesterday he purred and played in his pussy paradise

Decapitating tweetybirds and masticating mice

Now he's just 6 lbs of raw minced meat that don't smell very nice

He's nobody's Moggy now

Oh you who love your pussy be sure to keep him in

Don't let him argue with a truck, the truck is bound to win And upon the busy road don't let him play or frolic


If you do I'm warning you it could be CAT-astrophic







But with Living Thai Ways (Bangkok Books, Bangkok, 2006, 234pp) we have a parallel genre: the American retiree who rents a bungalow in Pattaya and after a few years, and the barest smattering of the Thai language, sets himself up as an expert on Thailand.

Author Michael Keller is the kind of bar-room bore from whom tourists flee screaming out into the night.

The volume I have is actually the second in his series, entitled More Living Thai Ways Part II and subtitled Dos and don'ts & short stories. The cover is a cute photo of a macaque monkey guzzling a can of Singha beer. That's about all this book has going for it.

You know what would make a great book? A memoir by a backpacker pioneer

who embarked on the Freak Trail 40 years ago and discovered virgin southern Thai beaches and hill-tribe trekking in the North.

But, why, oh why are we supposed to be interested in Michael Keller's hackneved travelogue of group geriatric bus tours in Chiang Mai, temple visits, souvenir-buying and taxi cab guides who speak a version of English I have never heard in



scending chapter about the security guards Keller has hired for his Pattaya bungalow. One sees a ghost and reports the incident this way:

"Ghost sit in palm tree. Watch me. Ooooooh-eeee! Evil come out of palm tree. It make open the gate in mystery. Big ghost float inside say 'Hello'! What can I do? Oooooh-eeee! Evil spirit try get me. I

no go back working outside till devil-one go bye-bye. Monk need come. Burn incense! Make blessing on house. Chant!

Keller is always telling the reader how much he loves Thai people, but you get the sense that they are mostly comical oddities to him.

In other chapters he goes on to tell you how he came to rent his house and adopt "a little doggie" named Miss Moo. He dotes on the mutt with so much sentimental schmaltz you want to strangle the little bitch.

Then he tells you how to get a Thai massage, ending this chapter with: "Take Miss Moo's Wise Advice: Go get a Thai massage!" I mean, how awful can you

More awful. He yammers on and on about loutish Pattaya tourists. "Undesirable visitor behavior in any country is unacceptable...For those obnoxious few, common sense seems not to prevail while on holiday in Thailand," he whines from his perch as prissy moralist.

Then he's back on the geriatric tour group beat again, describing a khantoke dinner and a hill tribe "cultural show" at the Chiang Mai Cultural Center.

For pure filler he provides pages upon pages of farang food items available at Thai supermarkets and an entire chapter on Thai fruits. When will this ever end?

More chapters on Thai holidays and transportation routes and Thai snakes and reptiles. Finally, he lists all the ways to do volunteer vacation work in Thailand, concluding: "Opportunity knocks. Are you listening?"

Hell, no.

## Manage not to waste

Of the numerous infrastructure problems currently facing Phuket, none are more pressing than that of solid-waste management. There is no disputing the basic facts: the total amount of solid waste Phuket produces has grown more than 5% annually over the past decade, resulting in some 460 tons of garbage that currently needs to be burned every day – and about 30% higher during the tourist high season. This is almost double the Saphan Hin incineration plant's rated capacity of 250 tons per day.

Even if Phuket City gets the requested 1 billion baht in funding it desperately needs from the central government to build a second incinerator, the furnace probably won't come online before waste production on the island has exceeded the 500 ton-per-day mark, meaning that it will be overburdened before it is even built.

Making matters worse, the island's only landfill, also at Saphan Hin, has already reached full capacity. Is it any wonder that garbage continues to pile up along roadsides and on private land?

Other problems at the incinerator are well-documented, including the fact that about half of the waste incinerated there is organic, including leftover food, vegetable matter, disposable diapers and their contents – and much more.

Burning these results in incomplete combustion, which reduces burning efficiency and results in the release of dangerous substances – including dioxin – into the environment.

With such a dire situation at hand, one would expect local government agencies to take decisive action – yet there has been little tangible action to address this issue, which is a grave threat to our tourism economy.

One way that the amount of garbage we produce could be trimmed overnight would be to impose a provincial ban on the distribution of advertising circulars by large retailers such as Tesco-Lotus, Big-C, Courts, HomePro and the newest entry Carrefour.

Untold numbers of these unsolicited enticements to buy are spread around the province every day, with most going completely unread before they eventually end up being sold as scrap – or worse – needlessly burned at the incinerator.

All it would take to put a stop to this practice would be a provincial order or a gentleman's agreement among the companies involved, who would still have numerous advertising options to choose from.

If all agreed to end this unsustainable practice, the retail playing field would remain even – and retailers might even be able to pass along the savings to their consumers in the form of lower prices. What better way of attracting shoppers could there possibly be?



# Teachers need vetting

agree with the Ministry of Education's policy to enforce strict checks on foreign teachers. This order does not make it harder for us to find English teachers and it allows us to be more confident in our children's safety and education.

All we are concerned about is ensuring that all our teachers have valid visas.

Almost all of the subjects in our English-language program are taught in English. The only exceptions are Thai language, social studies and history, all of which we feel are best taught in Thai as they are very detailed.

Therefore we need wellqualified teachers to run the program. Currently, we have 16 foreign teachers teaching the 234 English Program students. The program runs from grade matayom 1 to matayom 4 [about 12 to 16 years oldl.

We already have a strict screening system for foreign teachers applying to work at our school. We require that all teachers must have a degree in the subject they will teach.

For example, a mathematics teacher must have a degree in mathematics. They must also have a reference letter from their previous employer.

We double check the source of all documents to protect against forgeries. If an applicant has worked in any schools in Phuket before, we check their record while they were teaching at that school. Schools here cooperate well together.

We have a committee for recruiting foreign teachers that checks all documents to make sure the applicant is properly qualified.

Most importantly, we try to employ only native English speakers, as parents are keen that their



## **FIRST PERSON**

n September 29 last year the Ministry of Education (MoE) introduced tough new regulations requiring all new teachers to have at least a bachelor's degree and to pass an extensive background check before they can begin work.

The move came following the deportation of American John Mark Karr, a former suspect in the 1996 murder of six-year-old JonBenet Ramsey in Boulder, Colorado, who was employed at a school in Bangkok.

Amnuay Pupatanun, Head of of Satree Phuket School's English Program and responsible for screening foreign teachers to be employed by the school, explained to the *Gazette* the measures he takes in checking foreign teachers applying to the program.

children learn correct pronuncia-

When all the documents have been checked and approved we have the applicant teach a trial lesson so that the recruiting committee can be sure he or she can really teach. We consider if the applicant can convey knowledge to students effectively and if he or she can focus on the right aspects of a subject.

After the lesson, we assess the applicant's performance and make suggestions. The committee will then carry out a more detailed interview with the applicant. After that, the committee assembles the results of all the assessment procedures and decides whether to offer a job to the applicant.

Since the MoE ordered stricter background checks to be made on foreign teachers applying for jobs, we check any applicants against the blacklist on the MoE website that is constantly updated. There are two lists of blacklisted teachers; one for teachers found to have fake qualifications and one for child

We give new teachers a four-month probation period. During this period, the new teachers are assessed by the students, myself and other managementlevel teachers. We do not inform teachers beforehand when their lessons will be observed. We also take into account how well they cooperate with other members of staff.

If the new teacher passes the assessments, we offer them a full contract. If we feel there is room for improvement, we will give them recommendations and extend their probation period. If there is no improvement after the extended period is over, we cancel their contract.

My students have had many foreign English teachers and have told me what they expect and hope for in an English teacher. This information is a great help to us when we are recruiting new teachers or assessing existing

The problem we have in hiring foreign teachers now is that the salary here is lower than in other provinces, especially Bangkok. Here we offer an initial salary of 30,000 baht, but in Bangkok foreign [native English-speaking] teachers start at 40,000 to 50,000

This means that foreign teachers often don't stay with us for a long time. We have a very high turnover of employees and are struggling to solve the prob-

We try to offer incentives to keep teachers with us. For example, mathematics and science teachers, when they have passed probation, get 8,000 baht a month extra on top of their salaries. Mathematics and science teachers are the most difficult to find.

We pair foreign teachers with a Thai "buddy" teacher to help them in case they have any

We do have some cultureclash problems, but no so often. We deal with this by holding annual cultural courses for foreign teachers to explain to them how to act and what to expect from Thai students.

If we are short of English Program teachers, we can move teachers from the Thai program or can request teachers from Prince of Songkla University (PSU) to come and help us. If we cannot find native Englishspeaking teachers, we will accept Thai teachers who hold degrees from abroad or who can communicate well in English. They receive the same salary as foreign teachers.

The high teacher turnover problem could be solved by agreements between the Thai government and foreign governments. For example, the government should introduce a teacherexchange program to provide Thailand with good teachers from English-speaking countries.

On the whole, the new MoE policy makes us feel confident that we will have good teachers in our schools. This is very good for children and will put parents' minds at rest too.

Water Supply (PPWS), replies:

For many years Phuket has suffered water shortages during the high season because supply has been insufficient to meet demand. Patong, Kata and Karon have suffered the most. This is why we have built a desalination plant in Karon to help to solve the problem of water shortages in those three areas.

The plant, which is still undergoing testing, is currently producing about 7,000 cubic meters of water a day. We expect the plant to be working at its full capacity of 12,000m<sup>3</sup>/day by the beginning of March.


We sometimes check bars in the Nanai area but we mostly focus on checking bars and entertainment venues on Soi Bangla, because it's a busy area with many bars and many people.

I called the Soi Dog Foundation and found there was no more room at the inn. I begged and pleaded – our house has 17 strays already – despite living in the jungle, our inn is also full. After a little finagling and flattery, the Soi Dog field team of K. Sanae and K. Nok found temporary space at the Phuket Animal Hospital. A rendezvous was arranged and we captured the five pups hiding in thick vegetation.

I felt good. It was a successful collection, with not one puppy going under car wheels.



# Creating a culture of respect for life

## THE GRAY AREA

hand – feeding a captured whitebellied sea eagle.

The juvenile white-belly came to my attention a month earlier when neighbors tried to sell me the bird. They had rescued the raptor from a man who had sling-shot it in the rubber trees.

When I first saw the eagle, its wings were seriously clipped – a maiming akin to a human having both legs chopped off.

I refuse to buy wildlife, but I fed the bird every day and massaged it with love. They finally "gave" me the eagle.

I was elated, but disturbed. It takes six months for the primary feathers to come back, and the eagle wants to soar above the clouds. Instead, it's in jail.

I haven't been to Patong at night for years, but I hear the wildlife touts are out in force, walking past police patrols despite laws meant to control them.

So what's going on? Despite the hard work of groups like PAWS and Soi Dog, people still abandon dogs. I would never call the "pound" in America, but Soi Dog hosts animals for life – nothing like the "In-Humane Society," the cost-effective American way, where good dogs are executed after just three days.

We build Phuket's biggest and busiest roads, where dogs run free until they get hit, but we don't finish the job by adequately funding Soi Dog Foundation and PAWS. It's common knowledge that wildlife laws are woefully enforced in Thailand, but nobody blows the whistle.

Why aren't the Thai-language media doing their job? Commercial viability comes with a price: social responsibility. A few public service announcements are in order – people can't learn unless they are informed. community with an organized and comprehensive community fund. The basis would be contributions – no matter how small – from every business and employee on the island. Ten baht a month would be enough for the minimum contribution.

Such an effort is more about awareness than money, but the money is still necessary to create a bit of commitment.

First, Phuket community leaders must come together for a common goal – making Phuket more livable, socially- and environmentally-aware, and attractive for tourists.

Such an effort requires dialog – well-publicized dialog. If community-proud Phuket leaders would discuss these issues, they would discover that others also care. In the process, a beneficial social plan would develop. That's how a sense of community can evolve.

Once a social agenda is developed, people still need to know their money is well-spent. The best guarantee is citizen review committees, where icons and housewives review budget requests and follow the money to make sure it is corruption-free and well-spent. Yes, even Thai society can be corruption-free – we just need highly visible and transparent citizen committees to ensure it.

Then, the money must be spent effectively. A few years ago, I was on the board of a major non-governmental organization (NGO) – the only board member in history who actually did site reviews of the programs. The NGO did nothing, so I

dropped out. They can't do the same with a panel of 20 citizens who will yank their funding if programs aren't effective.

Finally, fund-raising requires social pressure – and that means publicity. When issues become publicized, it is harder to ignore them. Dog-deserters, reckless drivers and parents who don't provide their children with motorbike helmets need to be given a message from neighbors, coworkers and though the media.

In only 15 years, Mayor Edward Hagedorn worked a miracle in Puerto Princesa – a provincial town in the Philippines. Starting with no money and a policy of zero tolerance for corruption, Hagedorn convinced his constituents that brooms are good for the environment, that traffic laws exist for a reason, and that stray dogs are not just unsightly, but the responsibility of humans.


He virtually eliminated corruption by creating transparency. By setting a positive example, he dramatically cut drug use and crime motivated by peer pressure.

Mayor Hagedorn proved that even in Asia, people will care, once they become aware.

Does Phuket have the courage to do the same?

# COMPUTER Fixing Vista - Already

he first round of bug fixes for Windows Vista are available. Chances are good that if you use Vista, you haven't received automatic notification of their exist-

You can see them if you click Start | All Programs | Windows Update and then in the upper left corner click the top line, which says Check for Updates. At this point, I recommend that Vista users download and install the available updates. Pass on the language packs, unless you really need them.

If you buy a new Vistacompatible computer, you should NOT assume that you have the latest video driver.

If you have a high tolerance for pain and decide to upgrade a Windows XP machine to Vista, make sure you start with the Windows Upgrade Advisor. It will help point you to the right video driver.

Regardless of which path you choose to Vista enlightenment, once Vista is up and running, drop by your video card manufacturer's website to make sure you have the latest video

In the past, I've warned people about installing the latest, greatest video drivers, because they had a tendency to create more problems than they solved.

For the next few months, though, you should keep up with the latest versions of the video drivers, as the manufacturers (working with Microsoft) swat Vista bugs left and right.

Not sure which brand of video card you have? In Vista, click Start | Control Panel, then click the System and Maintenance link. Scroll down to the Device Manager icon and click the View Hardware and Devices link. Then double-click on Display Adapters.

Menus: If you've used Windows XP for more than a week, you've undoubtedly had occasion to dig into Windows Explorer's menus. To map a network drive, for example, click Tools, Map a Network Drive. To Undo a copy or a Rename, click Edit, Undo. To have Windows show filename

choose Tools, Folder Options, View. You can even use Windows XP Explorer's menus to move up one level in the folder hierarchy: View, Go To, Up One Level. All of those are simple actions with Windows XP's Explorer. Just click on the right menu, and it's done lickety-split.

But when you try the same things with Vista, it doesn't work the same way. There aren't any menus. You hunt and click and peck and swear, and ten minutes later come up empty-handed: things that are easy to do in Windows XP's Explorer just aren't possible in Vista's Explorer. Or at least it appears that way.

Where did Vista's Explorer menus go? That's easy, grasshopper. Microsoft hid them to protect you. Over the course of years, Windows menus in general (and Microsoft Office menus in particular) grew into malevolent, gruesome, sprawling and illogical monsters. Instead of Explorer to show you menus? It's

cleaning up the menus, the Powers That Be employed the Red Queen approach: Off With Their

In the latest incarnations of Microsoft products, menus appear in some places, don't appear in others, straddle the fence occasionally, and make a mournful sucking noise here and there.

Several of the new Office applications have done away with menus completely - you can't get them back for love nor money. But other Office 2007 apps will only work if you deign to click the menus.

Outlook 2007 demonstrates the Emperor's new clothes bigtime: Outlook itself only works with menus, but its email editor (Word 2007 in drag) hasn't a menu to its name. It's like watching Michael Moore saunter down the runway at Gucci's spring fash-

So how do you get Vista's

easy. Press the Alt key. That brings Windows Explorer's menus back, putting them front and center where the Windows Gods intended. (The same trick works in Internet Explorer.)

Unfortunately, pressing the Alt key doesn't bring the menus back permanently. In fact, if you click just about anywhere inside the Explorer window, Vista takes it upon itself to turn the menus off again. Fortunately, there's a quick way to make the menus appear all the time. Here's how:

- 1. Inside Vista, bring up Windows Explorer (say, click Start, Documents or Start, Computer).
- 2. Press the Alt key. That brings up the menus.
- 3. Click Tools, Folder Options. Then click the View tab.
- 4. Near the top, check the box that says Always Show Menus.
- 5. While you're here, make Vista show you hidden files and folders (click the button marked Show Hidden Files and Folders); make Vista show you filename extensions (in all of my books I rant about Microsoft's stupid design decision to hide filename extensions - uncheck the box marked Hide Extensions for Known File Types); and have Vista show you all of your files (uncheck the box marked Hide **Protected Operating System Files** (Recommended) - note that you have to click through a Warning dialog box).

6. Click OK.

Congratulations. You've just taken off Vista Explorer's training wheels. More Vista tips are coming in the weeks ahead.

## Tourism bosses head for Berlin

PHUKET: The Phuket Tourist Association (PTA) and the Tourism Authority of Thailand's (TAT) Southern Region 4 office will once again be sending representatives to the International Tourism Bourse (ITB) in Berlin on March 7 to 11.

The Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (Or-BorJor) has provided a 2 million baht budget for the booth and decorations at the event, which annually draws nearly 7,500 exhibitors from 190 countries.

This comes on the heels of the TAT's decision to reduce the tourist-arrival target for the country from 20 million to 16 million as the organization re-evaluates its tactics. Newly appointed TAT Governor Pornsiri Manoharn said that the original target was too high and did not match the goal of becoming a leading world destination in terms of quality.

Phuket, however, will still aim for 4.7 million tourists, the same as last year, said Suwalai Pinpradab, Director of TAT's Southern Region 4 office.

"We lost many tourists after the tsunami – there were only about two million in 2005 – but the number of tourists increased in 2006 to about 4.7 million, which was almost the same as the year before the tsunami," she said.

The government's policy for this year is to emphasize quality tourists, but K. Suwalai said that Phuket already draws high-quality tourists as the cost of living in and visiting Phuket is high, especially in hotel prices.

"The other quality tourists are those concerned with the environment and natural resources conservation. We now have Scandinavians who are conscientious about environmental conservation, as we can see some groups are coming here to plant trees," she said.

TAT also has a goal of tourists in Phuket spending an average of 4,000 baht per person per day, an increase from last year's goal of 3,700 baht.

"In our region we emphasize nature tourism, entertainment, shopping and sports activities. At the same time, we still want to promote medical tourism, as we did last year, because we are only successful in dental cosmetic and plastic surgery, but we still can promote the other medi-

cal treatments as well," she said.

K. Suwalai said that the tourism authorities in Phuket are striving to bring in tourists throughout the year, not just during the traditionally high-tourist season. The Scandinavian market is expected to be the main market in the rainy season, while



#### eaders often email me requesting details of my portfolio management service and the returns that can be expected.

The answer is anything but straightforward as there are many variables involved. In short, returns hinge on two major factors: the individual's needs and attitudes, and what the future will

Portfolio managers often talk about an asset mix of 65% equities, 30% bonds and 5% cash, or 75%, 20% and 5%. These combinations lack imagination, and in the period from 2000 to 2003 they were a recipe to lose money. Some investors who chose this mix are vet to fully recover, and some investment houses have now added commercial property to their asset mix.

I do not understand the attraction of bonds. Yields on 10-

year government bonds vary from slightly more than 4% on 10-year "bunds" (German government bonds denominated in euros) to currently 4.8% on their US equivalent, and just under 5% on UK 10-year "gilts".

Why invest in bonds when

there are alternatives that provide double the returns without the risk? Emerging market bonds might be considered different from bonds in general as returns have been high, but I still think an exit strategy is essential.

Most investors look at investments as assets - cash, equities, bonds or property – with the hope they will rise in value. However, as I have said time and again, prices rise and fall for commodities and assets of all descriptions, including the aforementioned, and currencies fluctuate. The world is not nearly as stable and predictable as we would like.

It is worthwhile to at least consider the proposition that to enter the field of investment while simply expecting any asset to rise in value is going to depend on lady luck. History has shown that during some periods it has been a successful strategy, but during others it has been at the very least a frustrating and a painful expe-

For example, consider the

# Strategy shifts see profits made on falling prices

American Dow Jones Index over the past century. The index managed to reach the 1,000 level in the late 1920s, but in 1929 it crashed. It was not until 1951 that the Dow hit 1,000 again, and from 1964 to 1981 it increased in value by just one point – not even 1%. For most of this period it was falling, despite periods of high inflation in the late 1970s. In short, over a 17-year period investors lost money in real terms – which means a lot of money.

Therefore, it would seem

logical to have an investment strategy that not only tries to profit on rising investment values, but also when prices are falling. There is a shift in the minds of many away from the idea of an "absolute return" strategy and towards making profits regardless of



While not every asset class is appropriate for this approach - property is a perfect example - many other asset and commodities classes are routinely used in this fashion and have been for decades.

In my opinion, the fund approach is the only route to take; it gives transparency and a regulatory discipline.

Currencies, stocks, bonds, hard and soft commodities all make for easy inclusion into a long or short fund. Some managers will use a wide range of options, others will limit the range on purpose.

Assets in a fund are often capped at, say, US\$100 million (about 3.5 trillion baht). Some fund managers are comfortable with this level of investment, as they are able to maneuver their portfolios to avoid being so large that they become the market itself. Small, in relative terms, enables flexibility.

Investment management at

"the coal face" usually entails much research and a continual review of the investment portfolio. There is another route, however. It still involves detailed research, but the ongoing investment is controlled by a computer. This is called "emotionless trad-

This week's article merely touches the surface of strategies that profit on falling asset prices as well as rising prices. Next week I will look at several examples, which vary from the merely profitable to the exceptional. The approach will not be suitable for everyone, but it can be extremely profitable.

apital controls in Thailand have led to many unexpected consequences, one of them being a currency "tennis match" involving after-hours trading in the baht, commonly called "offshore trading".

The baht has been moving strongly upward overnight, then at the start of each business day the Bank of Thailand (Central Bank) has intervened to drive the value of the baht down to around 35.75 to 36 to the US dollar.

Initially the percentage movement was limited to around 2%. Bloomberg even commented that diminished liquidity was driving the baht up, not speculation.

However, by early February, it appeared that speculators had noted the strength of the baht in offshore trading and overnight currency appreciation started growing higher. At the time of writing this had raised the baht to about 33-34 to the US\$1. It has become so predictable that the currency is moving in wide bands on a daily basis.


What is also happening is that when people remit money to Thailand from overseas, the Thai banks are converting it at the overnight rate. This allows them to pay much less in baht than would be the case if they waited until the Bank of Thailand entered the market in the morning.

No doubt every Thai bank would deny using this strategy. In reality, it is such an easy route to make a 5% to 7% profit as to be irresistible.

The baht is facing market forces that want to move the currency higher. It is a very complex issue, but it shows that central banks find it almost impossible to resist strong market trends.

The Malaysians are facing a similar situation, but their reaction has been different. They are emphatic that they will not introduce capital controls but are content to simply intervene to stop their currency appreciating too rapidly.


About 4,000 competitors from 40 countries are expected to compete, an increase from last year's 2,000 runners.

### Title fights to showcase Thailand's best boxers

BANGKOK: Thailand will host two World Boxing Council (WBC) world championship prizefights in March, one pitting top-ranked Thais against each other.

On March 2, superbantamweights Napapol Kittisakchokchai (40-2, 36 KOs) and Saenghiran Lookbanyai (20-0, 15 KOs) will meet to determine who will receive a shot at the world championship currently held by Israel Vazquez.

"Saenghiran and Napapol are ranked number one and two in the WBC and the matching of these two outstanding Thais in an interim title contest is a historic occasion," said WBC Vice-President Pol Gen Kovid Bhakdibhumi.

Also in March, number-one ranked Thai strawweight Oleydong Sithsamerchai faces number-two ranked Omar Soto of Puerto Rico.

Both bouts are interim championship title fights, which are normally held when a champion is injured or in a legal predicament. However, the WBC has judged the bouts worthy of championship status in appreciation of the HM The King's 80th birthday later this year.

Should Sithsamerchai win, he would then challenge current champion Eagle Kyowa (17-1, 6 KOs) for the world title. Kyowa, a Thai now fighting out of Japan, has defended his belt three times since winning it from Katsunari Takuyama in August 2005.

Recently, at the annual Asian Boxing Council (ABCO) conference, Gen Bhakdibhumi declared six Thai fighters ready for WBC title fights: Napapol

Kittisakchokchai, Saenghiran Lookbanyai, Oleydong Sithsamerchai, Chonlatarn Piriyapinyo, Devid Lookmahanak and Sirimongkol Singwancha.

The Kittisakchokchai-Lookbanyai match promises to be an explosive one. Lookbanyai has knocked out 75% of his foes while Kittisakchokchai's KOs stand at 90%. Kittisakchokchai, 28, has the edge in experience and has fought one world-class fight, losing to Oscar Larios in 2003 when he challenged for the WBC Superbantamweight title. He's gone on to rack up 17 straight victories since the loss and briefly held the WBC International title.

At 26, Lookbanyai has the chin to stand up to his opponent's heavy fists and may be the fresher of the two.

Both fighters have faced relatively soft opposition during their careers. Neither fighter is

on the *Ring Magazine* (US) nor the *Boxing Monthly* (UK) rankings, and regardless of the winner current champion Israel Vasquez stands to keep the title.

ABCO champion and WBC number 6 featherweight Piriyapinyo passed his toughest test in September, winning a hard-fought, but unanimous, decision over former WBC Superbantamweight champion Yoddamrong Sityodtong.

The undefeated fighter from Chon Buri has defended his ABCO belt 12 times and hopes to get a chance at a title later in the year.

Superflyweight Lookmahanak worked his way up to WBC number 2 by winning his first 15 fights. The 115-pounder was ABCO's Fighter of the Year in 2006, but will be hard pressed to defeat WBC champion Christian Mijares or number 1 Mexican superstar Jorge Arce.

### Roberts keeps Langkawi title

MALAYSIA: Former King's Cup winner Ray Roberts and his crew on *Ulumulu* have successfully defended their title in the IRC Racing class at the Royal Langkawi International Regatta, held from February 4 to 9.

Teiki Ballian and his South Thailand Youth Team snapped up third place.

Back as defending champions of the Multi-hull Racing class, Roger Kingdon and his crew on *Moto Inzi* had the edge in the one-design Racing Multi-hull (Firefly) class, comprising an all-Phuket-built fleet, with five first-place finishes.

Henry Kaye's *Mamba* came second in the class, with Bill Phelps's *Twin Sharks* third.







## Out of the box

any people would not have looked twice at the townhouse. Although the home, in Land & Houses Park, behind Wat Chalong, was built on the bank of an old tin mine lagoon and has scenic views of the hills to the west, it is one of many identical homes built as part of a project.

But Somporn "Zhu" Trakarnboonchai saw the building and had different ideas. It had fired her imagination. She has since transformed the house from an enclosed block to a home of open space and creative ideas.

K. Zhu has studied interior design over the past few years as part of her career change from being an antique and silver dealer. In remodeling the home, which took some five months, she elicited advice from many artisan friends.

High on her list of priorities was creating the impression of much more space from a standard

townhouse five meters wide and 21m long, on a 210-square-meter plot. "Many townhouses have 'fixed space' and are designed to make you feel like you're living in a box.

"Here, we changed all that by removing all the ceiling panels to make the house airy, spacious, wellventilated," said K. Zhu, adding that the renovation included knocking down several walls to create more open space.

After knocking out

the partitions, K. Zhu used different colors and patterns of wood to make room boundaries obvious. "Old houses have character. If we take the time to think we can come up with many ideas about what we can change about the house. I find it exciting, and we're impressed with what we have done,' said K. Zhu.

K. Zhu and her husband, Dirk Naumann, describe their decor scheme as a mix and match of modern and antique. They have always had a panache for antiques, and collected most of the antique furniture and decorations dotted around the house during their travels over the years. The antique maps that adorn the walls are from when Mr Naumann was an antique map dealer.

"My wife accomplished two things with this house: she opened it up to make the eyes flow around the house, and she used a variety of textures, materials and colors to make the house more airy, because it is not big," said Mr Naumann.

# Underdog of the plant world

trouble is underdogs don't make it very often, which is why I've got a soft spot for them.

Take football, for example. Probably one of the best-known tournaments in the world is the FA Cup, in England. I think they even let the Welsh in too.

Anyway, the eventual winners are fairly predictable – it's quite likely to be Liverpool, Man United, Chelsea, Arsenal, or any of the usual crowd that hover around the top of the Premier League.

Just about the only time I get excited in the qualifying rounds that lead up to the FA Cup final is when somebody you've never heard of beats one of the big teams, causing their victims to become mightily embarrassed

In 2001, Wycombe Wanderers defeated Premiership-side Leicester City, and were only narrowly defeated in the semi-final by Liverpool. Kidderminster Harriers were the last non-league team to reach the fifth round of the FA Cup, in 1994. They defeated Birmingham City and Preston North End before eventually falling to Premiership-side West Ham United. Keep them coming.

I remember back a few years when one of my local teams in the UK, Harrogate Railway Athletic, reached the second round of the FA Cup. They lost, obviously, but it was fun. Not at

'm all for the underdog. The all bad for a team whose ground consists of a field next to a railway track. Their total seating capacity is zero; it really is just a

> I'm no boxing fan, but I couldn't help cracking a quiet smile of satisfaction in 1990 when boxer James "Buster" Douglas, given odds of 42-to-1 by some bookmakers, managed to topple the previously-undefeated Mike Tyson – his first-ever professional defeat.

> The plant world has its underdogs too. Weeds. Gardeners can be a pretty zealous lot, often keen to rip anything out of the ground that they haven't put there themselves. Any uninvited guest in the garden is trespassing by default, and deserves death by uprooting. No trial or jury, just instant justice.

> Sometimes the merciless extraction of something growing in a carefully tended flower bed seems a little unjust to me. Perhaps taking just one look and concluding whether or not a plant has a right to exist in our gardens is a bit hasty; maybe the underdog deserves a chance after all.

> With this thought in mind, I tried an experiment some time ago. I filled a large pot with potting compound but planted nothing in it. I fed and watered this pot, as I did everything else in the garden, but decided not to take issue with anything that decided to grow there of its own accord.

> > Admittedly, what appeared

more often than not was that rather annoying trailing grassy thing that grows an inch a day, spreading everywhere; the one that serves no other purpose but to irritate gardeners. Also, I got a lot of those tall spindly weeds with tiny purple flowers at the end that almost need wire cutters to hack through, along with Thaistyle "daisies" and other assorted undesirables.

I should be able to go on at length with all sorts of impressive sounding names for all these, but to be honest, I haven't a clue what any of them are called. They were just weeds. They've all certainly done their homework in terms of self-preservation, as it seems to be very difficult to eradicate any of them.

But one of the results of this very unscientific experiment was pleasantly surprising. A rather attractive flowering plant eventually emerged, which, following the conventional rules, would have been dismissed as an "undesirable" in the initial stages.

The barleria cristata, or Philippine violet (ang-kaap in Thai) is a small shrub, with twinpetaled flowers on the end of a half-inch tube, in varying shades of mauve. There are a couple of other varieties, one with white flowers and another with a striped combination. It just appears out of nowhere, its seeds presumably spread on the wind.

Many gardeners intentionally plant barleria and use it as a small hedge, or even clip it into

strange geometric shapes. It's quite wiry and forgiving, and, like many other varieties of plant life here, will put up with a lot of abuse. About all it needs to thrive is plenty of sun and some water every now and then. If it's pruned regularly, it will become a lot bushier.

Barleria plays its underdog character well. It shows up looking a little sorry for itself, pretends it isn't really there at all and does its best to blend into the background without you noticing. Before you even realize it, barleria makes its home with you longterm, having started out as something that wasn't even wanted not unlike a soi dog that somehow seems to become part of the

As a single plant, barleria is not really that impressive. But put a few of these in the same patch of the garden, and it won't take long to develop into something a lot more worthwhile.

If you're not keen on waiting for a few barleria plants to appear in your garden in their own good time, another way of propagating more is by taking a reasonably thick, healthy-looking cutting and sticking it into some potting compost. It will take root quickly.

You can even buy them pregrown at the local garden center. A few baht will get you an underdog that's ready to go.

I'm thinking of packing a few of these in a box and sending it to England, addressed to "The National Team". It really doesn't matter which sport – it might be the gentle hint that they all seem to need.
