Aussie arrested for abducting daughter

PATONG: An Australian father who abducted his own daughter and demanded 30 million baht from his estranged wife was arrested at his rented apartment on Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd at 8 pm March 23.

Pol Lt Col Yodake Raksasuwan, Inspector at Phuket Immigration Office, told the *Gazette* that John Justin Goyen Leary, 39, was arrested after police discovered his whereabouts by tracing his mobile phone calls to a local pizza restaurant.

Col Yodake explained that Leary had collected his threeyear-old daughter Savannah from school on October 26 last year, then fled with her to Singapore before entering Malaysia.

"From there he sneaked into Thailand without passing through Immigration. The most recent entry in his passport is an entry stamp for Malaysia, so we believe that his intention was to have police presume that he was

still in Malaysia," he said.

Col Yodake said that Leary had allegedly demanded 30 million baht from his American-born estranged wife, who was granted custody of Savannah during their divorce, to have Savannah returned to Australia.

"Leary had been staying at

ADD Mansion in Patong since January 14. In late February, he called his wife in Australia on his mobile phone and said that his daughter was now staying with him. If she wanted her daughter back, she would have to transfer 30 million baht to him," Col Yodake said.

"After that, his wife contacted the Australian police," he added

An investigation by Australian police led to the discovery that the call was made from Phuket.

Phuket Immigration officers searched mobile phone company records and found that Leary's phone was used to order pizzas from a restaurant in Patong.

"So we checked with the restaurant and they showed us where he was staying," Col Yodake explained.

He added that Leary had also made several calls to a pharmacy to place orders for Valium.

Leary has been charged with illegally entering the Kingdom

At the time of going to press, Leary was being held by Immigration in Bangkok pending an extradition request by Australia

Savannah was taken to the Pha Ya Thai Children's Residence, also in Bangkok, and has been picked up by her mother.

Phuket's poor protest govt inaction

PHUKET CITY: About 300 angry villagers from more than 20 slum communities protested noisily outside Phuket Provincial Hall on March 22, demanding that Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit help alleviate their poverty.

Protest leader Supat Nunkhao, from Pla Katak Pattana community on Koh Sireh, told the *Gazette* that the villagers want the provincial authorities to develop their homes and basic services

"Everyone in our villages has been waiting for help from the government for a long time, but we still have nothing," he said.

K. Supat said that, apart from wanting a decent home and access to utilities, the protesters also want to be free from the risk of being charged or evicted due to encroachment, as many do not legally own the land they live on.

"There are some villagers

now living on public land, but we don't get development assistance from anyone. All the government agencies just pass the buck.

"The Tambon Administration Organizations (*OrBorTor*) don't take responsibility and push us off to the Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*).

"The *OrBorJor* sends us off to the provincial authorities, and the provincial authorities tells us it is the Land Office's respon-

sibility. Now no one helps us," he said

Initially the villagers insisted that they would not leave until they had spoken to the Governor despite being told that he was away in Bangkok.

About 3 pm, Vice-Governor Tri Augkaradacha returned to the hall and representatives handed him a letter demanding the province come to the communities' aid. The protesters then disbanded.





Search for bypass shooter continues

PHUKET CITY: The search continues for a Phuket youth suspected of shooting and beating a man on the bypass road on February 19.

Chatchai Chuenjitsoonthorn and his wife, Maliwan, were attacked by a motorbike gang of about 20 youths while on their way home from a late-night meal.

The couple identified the shooter from police photographs. The attack was motivated by the youths allegedly not liking the way K. Chatchai looked at them.

Maj Sompong Boonrat, Deputy Inspector at Phuket City Police Station, told the Gazette that an arrest warrant has been issued for the alleged shooter.

"We are continuing to investigate and have some more small clues to work with in bringing the criminals to justice," he said.

SIPA launches utilities payments website

Domestic flights return to Don Muang Airport

PHUKET: Thai Airways International (THAI), Nok Air and One-Two-GO domestic flights between Phuket and Bangkok have resumed services at Don Muang Airport, Bangkok's former international airport.

Kalayapha Panich, THAI's District Sales Manager for Upper-Southern Thailand, explained that THAI flights to and from Bangkok run from both airports in the capital.

"Passengers are welcome to choose which destination they want: Don Muang or Suvarnabhumi. We are happy to make the changes and do our best for them," she said.

Each day until October 27, the first THAI flight from Don Muang to Phuket is at 7:20 am and the final flight at 7:30 pm. The first flight from Phuket to Don Muang is at 9:25 am and the last flight departs the island at 9:35 pm.

Also until October 27, the first THAI flight from Suvarnabhumi to Phuket is at 8 am and the last at 6:20 pm. In the opposite direction, the first flight from Phuket to Suvarnabhumi is at 10:10 am and the last at 8:40 pm.

THAI flights using Don Muang Airport will be coded with four digits, starting with 1 - TG1203, for example – while those operating out of Suvarnabhumi Airport will have just three digits, K. Kalayapha explained.

Nok Air has announced a new flight schedule, which came into effect March 25, corresponding with its move to Don Muang. Daily flights to Phuket depart Don Muang from 7:30 am through to 5:55 pm Mondays to Thursdays and Saturdays, and a late service departs 8:10 pm Fridays and Sundays.

Nok Air daily flights to Don Muang depart Phuket from 9:15 am to 7:45 pm Mondays to Thursdays and Saturdays, and a late service departs 9:55 pm Fridays and Sundays.

One-Two-GO also resumed

using Don Muang on March 25, but has kept some services flying to and from Suvarnabhumi.

Flights to Phuket depart Suvarnabhumi at 2:30 pm daily; and at 10:20 am on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays; and at 6:20 pm on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays.

Flights from Phuket to Suvaranbhumi depart the island at 12:10 pm daily; and at 8:10 am on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays; and at 4:20 pm on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays.

Daily flights to Phuket depart Don Muang at 7 am, 10:40 am, 2:30 pm and 6:20 pm, while One-Two-GO flights departing Phuket for Don Muang leave at 8:50 am, 12:30 pm, 4:30 pm and 8:10 pm.

Phuket business owner Vatchara Pongsa, who regularly flies between Phuket and Bangkok, told the Gazette that she is very happy that flights have returned to Don Muang.

"Suvarnabhumi is too big and too far to walk inside, it takes too long to get my luggage. But at Don Muang, everything is much more convenient. It is just a short walk to the car park or to get a taxi, and the cost of a limo or taxi is much cheaper at Don Muang," she said.

Phuket Tourist Association Vice-President Panu Maswongsa told the Gazette, "There should be no problems for passengers flying to and from Phuket. Nothing much has changed; passengers just need to check and specify which airport they want to go to," he said.

Phuket Bike Week returns

PHUKET: Several thousand bikers from all over the world are expected to participate in the 13th Annual Phuket Bike Week 2007 to be held April 14 and 15 by Phuket Riders Club and Ride Thailand Magazine.

Throughout the weekend bikes such as Harley-Davidsons, BMWs, Ducatis and Hondas will be touring the island, including a procession through Patong, Kata, Karon, Promthep Cape, Rawai and Thalang.

Past Phuket Bike Weeks have enticed at least 5,000 people to the island. Highlights of this year's festivities include a Big Bike and Motor Show on April 14 at 4 pm and a Biker Fashion Show by Harley-Davidson Bangkok at 9:30 pm that night.

Both expos will be held at Thainaan restaurant, opposite Central Festival Phuket, on Wichit Songkram Rd.

On April 15 activities will be centered around Jungceylon shopping center in Patong and will feature a Big Bike Party at 7 pm and the Miss Phuket Bike Week judging at 9 pm.

Cocaine traffickers and heroin dealers nabbed in one week

PATONG: Kathu Police arrested a Vietnamese couple on March 25 for possession of heroin with intent to sell, seizing more than 40 grams of the drug.

Acting on information provided by an informant, a team of officers from Kathu Police Station led by Investigations Inspector Lt Col Serm Kwannimit at 3 pm approached a single-room, second-floor apartment on Ratpatanusorn Rd.

As they neared, a shoe came flying out the flat's front door. Police found 12 small sachets of heroin in the shoe.

Inside the room, police found Vietnamese national Tran Van Tien, 38, and his 26-year-old roommate Don Tee Hieng, described by police as his wife.

Police searched the room and found 33 small paper sachets of powdered heroin with a total weight of 11.54g, plus several more solid chunks of the drug with a total weight of 30.1g. They also collected three syringes as evidence, Col Serm said.

Knowing the police were approaching, the couple threw out the drug-laden shoe in a desperate attempt to hide the evidence, he added.

"After we questioned the suspects, we learned that they regularly visit Thailand as guest workers," he said, adding that both held all the necessary documents to work in Thailand.

Don Tee Hieng, who had been previously arrested for selling fake "brand-name" clothes, was selling wigs and clothing at the time of her arrest.

Tran Van Tien told police that when they last entered the country, on March 23, he smuggled in three bars of heroin that he bought in Vietnam at a total cost of 7,000 baht. The weight of each bar was not disclosed.

Police failed to believe Tran Van Tien's claim that the heroin was for personal use only because of the amount of the drug seized and the fact that much of it had already been packed into small paper sachets typically used for sale to users.

Although Don Tee Hieng told police she had no knowledge of the drugs in the couple's shared room, both were arrested and charged with possession of a Category 1 narcotic with intent to sell.

They are now being held at Phuket Provincial Prison.

In another recent drug bust, two Peruvian men were arrested at Phuket International Airport on March 21 with more than two kilograms of cocaine they were

carrying internally.

A press release from Somyot Santarvorn, Chief Customs Inspector at Phuket International Airport, reported that Godoy Paz Sadi Mercedes, 29, was found in possession of 91 packets of cocaine, weighing 883g.

His accomplice, named as Panaifo Walky Elcodoro, 27, had ingested 124 packets weighing a total of 1,203g.

Thai-language press reports said that the men were on an international flight to Phuket when one of the men was no longer able

to keep his cargo in, excreting some of the packages into the airplane toilet.

Upon landing, customs officers found eight feces-smeared packages of the drug hidden in a shoe.

The men were X-rayed at Vachira Phuket Hospital, where the rest of the drugs were discovered – and recovered.

Both men were charged with importing a Class 2 drug without permission and are being held in Bangkok by the Royal Thai Police Narcotics Bureau.

Phuket-Penang flights to begin

PHUKET CITY: Malaysian Airlines' new low-cost carrier Firefly airlines will start daily direct flights between Phuket and Penang from April 13.

At a March 22 press conference at the Royal Phuket City Hotel, Malaysian Tourism Minister Datuk Seri Tengku Adnan Tengku Mansor said that Firefly will start another daily direct service between Samui and Penang on April 15.

Last year, about 1.9 million of Malaysia's 17.5 million tourists were from Thailand, and Tourism Minister Mr Tengku Mansor said that the country wants to increase that number to 2.2 million in the upcoming year.

"This year is a very special year for Malaysia because Malaysia is going to celebrate our 50 years as an independent nation," he said.

The target is 20.1 million tourists this year, he added.

Mr Tengku Mansor said that this year there will be 240 events held in Malaysia, which he hopes will attract Thai tourists.

The Malaysian Tourism Minister played down the troubles in Yala, Pattani and Narathiwat, saying that it had little effect on tourism in other areas.

"That's why I'm traveling here. I'd like to build confidence in my people that there is nothing wrong with Phuket, Haad Yai, Songkhla or anywhere else in southern Thailand," he said.

Austrian found dead in hotel room


PATONG: An Austrian man was found dead in his hotel room on March 22, an apparent victim of alcohol poisoning. According to Kathu Police, 38-year-old Dr Werner Jellen was found dead in room 302 of Patong Resort Hotel at 2:30 pm.


Pol Lt Col Sophon Borirak reported that there was no evidence of foul play in the room, in which two bottles of whiskey were found.

Police collected the man's belongings, listed as 920 euros in cash; 13 travelers' checks with a total value of 8,290 baht; a wristwatch, two cameras and two suitcases and their contents. Also collected was Dr Jellen's Austrian passport, numbered G09937080.

The daily log, noting that the victim's body was covered with vomit, listed the probable cause of death as toxic shock and heart failure from alcohol ingestion.







Bureaucratic bungle.

n October 25 last year, some 30 officials led by the Muang District Chief and Forestry Department officers raided a construction site located behind Baan Krating Resort at Ao Sane, just around the point from Le Meridien Royal Phuket Yacht Club in Nai Harn.

The construction was deemed illegal, as Forestry Department officials said the buildings were on a national forest reserve. Two construction foremen were arrested and later released on bail.

The raid followed a ban on all construction at the site issued August 15, 2006 by the Rawai Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*).

On March 18 this year, however, the Gazette inspected the site to find that not only had the 12 buildings been completed, but that foreign guests were already staying in some of the units.

Knowledge of the completion of the buildings came as surprise to some people, including Techin Weerawong, who was Muang District Chief Administrative Officer (Palad) when he led the October 25 raid on the site.

On March 21, he told the Gazette, "Really? It's finished already? I didn't know because I have moved to a new position at Phuket Provincial Hall."

K. Techin, now Chief of the Phuket Provincial Administrative and Justice Enactment Group, is still the head of the provincial committee investigating the alleged encroachment at Ao Sane.

However, K. Techin explained that although he was the senior government officer at the raid, illegal construction in Nai Harn came under the responsi-

he ghost of Phuket's land probe scandals in 2003 and 2004 has raised its ugly head in Nai Harn with the completion of 12 new villas and other guest accommodations developed as part of the Baan Krating Resort at Ao Sane in Nai Harn.

The resort owner claims he has a full Chanote land title to the land on which the new structures were built, but Forestry Department officials say they can prove it belongs to them.

To complicate matters, the land in question was once SorPorKor land, degraded forest land set for use by the poor for agricultural uses only.

The ownership dispute has now landed in the courts, but in the meantime guests at the resort get to enjoy their stay literally surrounded by forest.

bility of Rawai *OrBorTor*. "They can use the law to order a ban on construction, but if building continues that means that the builders have ignored the order.

"If the buildings are now finished, the next step is for Rawai OrBorTor to inform the police that the builders have ignored the order. The OrBorTor has the authority to do this.

"The latest report I received from Pol Lt Col Chockchai Sutthimek at Chalong Police Station was that police were still investigating whether the buildings were in a forest reserve area and that the case had not yet gone to court.

"I want to ask the police about their progress in this investigation and I want to ask Rawai OrBorTor why they have allowed construction to continue after they have ordered a ban on construction.

'Why haven't they informed the police that the or-

der has been ignored and they have continued building the resort? I want the media to closely follow up on this case, because now it's not in my responsibility now that I have moved to a new position."

Lt Col Chokchai, the officer responsible for investigating whether the buildings are on government land, was brief in his comments to the Gazette. On March 22 he said, "This case is still under investigation and it has not gone to court.

"So far, we have reviewed many documents and much evidence from the old 'owner' of that land, and we have interviewed the Phu Yai Baan for that area and Rawai OrBorTor offic-

"Officers from the Phuket Office of the Forestry Department are adamant that the buildings are in a forest reserve area, but we are waiting for the owner [of the buildings] to show us evidence that he owns that land," he added.

A source at Baan Krating Jungle Resort, who declined to have his name printed, told the Gazette, "I have several docu-

ments confirming that the buildings are not on forest land. I have had these documents for more than 10 years, since the land was bought from the previous owner.

"I think the Forest Department officers misunderstand which land is which. We can show them the land plot markers, which show that the buildings are about 50 to 60 meters from government land.

"The documents have been confirmed by three government offices, and I have sent these documents to police officers already. I have permission from the Land Office and the Forestry office that allows us to renovate the 42 existing buildings. The buildings are not on forest land, but we must wait for that be proven,"

Yet, that still leaves the matter of the resort continuing its construction of the new villas and guest accommodation in direct defiance of Rawai OrBorTor's

Lt Col Anek Mongkol, the police officer responsible for investigating the continued construction, said he knew nothing about the new buildings' comple-

"If construction has continued, that means they have ignored Rawai OrBorTor's order to stop building, which is another charge in addition to the two initial charges of building the resort without permission and disobeying an official order," Col Anek

"If they have not stopped construction, Rawai OrBorTor has the authority to ask police to inspect the site. We will compare the difference in the buildings' stage of completion, which will be

evidence with which we can charge them with ignoring the or-

"If the court rules that they have ignored an official order, it will be up to the court whether the buildings are to removed or not," he added.

Col Anek made it plain that two arrests have already been made, and that if police were to take further action they will need to receive another complaint from Rawai OrBorTor.

However, that complaint may not be coming.

Rawai OrBorTor President Aroon Solos on March 22 told the Gazette, "We informed police officers about this a long time ago. The men were arrested, and we checked again after the [October 25] raid and we can confirm that they had stopped construction.'

K. Aroon was surprised that the investigation was still under way. "I thought that this case would have been taken to court by now," he said, adding that he had handed the responsibility for follow-up action on the case to Rawai OrBorTor Public Works Chief Bumrung Pimonrattana-



K. Bumrung explained, "On August 15, 2006 we issued an order for construction of the new buildings to stop.

"But three days later, on August 18, 2006, the owner sent us a letter explaining that the resort was not building new structures, instead they wanted to renovate the existing wooden buildings that were built there in 1991," he said.

'They also attached a court

order permitting them to do so." K. Bumrung said that he action on the continued construction that saw the new buildings through to completion after the October 25 raid.

He says that he has already asked police to do so, and that his original complaint is what sparked the October 25 raid.

"I must look at the law first to see whether we can file complaints that will see extra charges laid for action after October 25," he said.

A senior official at the provincial Forestry Department office, who asked to remain anonymous, told the Gazette, "Baan Krating has lodged a claim to have a Chanote title issued for the land, and that claim is currently being heard in court.

"The Muang District Chief has explained to me that while the claim is being heard in court, they have the right to build on the land.

'We know that 37 rai in that area has been handed over to the Forestry Department, but I'm not sure about the adjoining land that might belong to the Phuket Provincial Land Reform Office."

However, the Forestry Department officer remains adamant that the buildings in question are on government land.

He said that about 8 rai, 2 ngan (about 11,200 square meters) is land covered by the 1941 Forest Act and one rai (1,600sqm) is regular forestry

"We have evidence that proves it's forestry land, but now the case is under investigation, which means that it's up to the court to rule in this case, he said.

To this, Vittawat Naksawad, a lawyer at the Phuket Provincial Agriculture Land Reform Office (ALRO), concurs.


He told the Gazette, "As part of the investigation into Baan Krating, we have inspected the site with Forestry Department officials and agreed that the land where Baan Krating is used to be SorPorKor land and it was definitely handed over to Forestry Department."

SorPorKor land is government land that local people were issued rights to use, but for agricultural purposes only, and it is regulated by the Agricultural Land Reform Office (ALRO).

"But whether a Chanote has been issued for it I don't know, that would be the responsibility of the Land Office," K. Vittawat said.

So was a Chanote land title deed for the disputed land ever issued by the Land Office, and if so – was it issued legally? That will be up for the courts to decide - so expect it to take

In the meantime, you probably won't be hearing too many complaints from the resorts guests about choice of accommodations.





Fundraiser a miraculous success

NAI HARN: About 1,000 local Buddhists attending a three-day fundraising event at Wat Nai Harn received a bit of a shock when the temple abbot Ajarn Prakhun Soonthorn appeared to suffer seizures during an intense chanting session on the first night of the ceremonies on March 15.

The monk later told concerned members of his flock that his sudden change in constitution was not from a medical disorder, but rather because he had "felt the presence" of the deity Jatukam Ramathep during the episode.

News of the event came to the *Gazette* from Gerard "Jay" Wiseman, 39, and his Thai partner Anong Khammeeto, 31, proprietors of the Come Inn Bar & Restaurant in Nai Harn. The couple attended morning, afternoon and evening prayer sessions on all three days.

"There were 29 temple abbots from all over Thailand, including one who is 113 years old. Many local Buddhists as well as some from other parts of Thailand had brought Buddhist amulets and statues to be blessed. We had brought our collection as well as a beautiful Pi Ganesh statue we have in front of our restaurant to protect against evil and such," Jay explained.

"All of us, maybe 1,000 people and as many amulets and Buddha image statues were connected by a single holy thread during the chanting...

"There were two women sitting close to us who were me-

diums. They were greatly affected by the ceremony; going into trances and collapsing. This was the norm for the Thai locals, but as a *farang* it was difficult for me to suppress my interest and

pay attention to the prayers of the chanting monks.

"At the end of about two hours of chanting, the crowd started to clear – that was when the abbot appeared to suffer a sei-

zure. The crowd rushed him, some massaging his feet, others putting tiger balm under his nose," he said.

"I thought maybe he was suffering from heat exhaustion from the many hours of the intense ceremonies, but later the next day we were told that he had actually felt the presence of Jatukam enter his body," said Jay.

Pictures taken by Jay that and the following evening had strange circular images that seemed to resemble the round amulets the monks had prepared for sale at the event. Jay developed the photos and returned the next day to give prints to some of the monks.

"The reaction from all was overwhelming with offers of money to have a copy," he said.

Refusing the money, he gave the few photos he had and promised to return with CDs and a few more prints the following day.

Asked if he believed the monk had really felt the presence of a deity, Jay said, "I am pretty open-minded and I have had experiences in life that are pretty hard to explain... but the energy

that seemed to consume everyone there was very positive.


"As for the pictures I took, I have seen similar [aberrations] before but not with the details and different colors – and they are making the amulets in these colors... But what convinced me that Jatukam really does affect people deeper than just on the surface is that the next day our restaurant was choc-a-bloc full.

"The whole reason people believe in Jatukam is the belief that if you have faith and pray to him, Jatukam will bring you good luck in your business... and we have been busy every night since," he said.

Jay and Anong showed the *Gazette* some Jatukam amulets they had bought during the fundraiser. Standard-issue amulets originally sold at just 500 baht are now fetching up to 10 times as much among amulet collectors. Some 4,000 of these were made, along with 200 "special edition" amulets. Rumor has it that 21 "first casting" amulets have been sold for more than 15,000 baht.

Some Jatukam amulets made 30 years ago in Nakon Sri Thammarat, originally sold for 100 baht but now fetch over 500,000 baht.

Whether what transpired at the prayer session in Nai Harn was a true miracle or not is a question of faith, but there is no doubt that the temple will finish its latest building project: 1.5 million baht was raised on the first night alone and entire proceeds over the three days netted more than four million baht, the couple told the *Gazette*.



Five-year-old boy murdered in Lipa Noi

five-year-old Thai-Austrian boy was murdered and his mother severely injured in an attack in Lipa Noi Subdistrict March 13.

The boy and his Thai mother, Araphan Yanacroft, 30, were sitting at the rear of their home when a man attacked them with

The boy's throat was cut during the attack, and he was stabbed several times.

K. Araphan suffered wounds to her throat and was rushed to hospital where she remains in a serious condition.

Lt Col Boonma Kaewlaead, Investigation Inspector at Koh Samui District Police Station,

said forensic evidence recovered from the scene of the murder has been sent for analysis. He also said that police are currently investigating more than 10 suspects in relation to the case.

One line of inquiry involves a building company hired by K. Araphan to build a house on the island. The owners of the company allegedly bought materials worth several hundred

thousand baht on credit from a local supplier but neglected to pay the bill. Police interviews have revealed this resulted in several heated arguments between the owners of the company, who have since disappeared, and K. Araphan.

Another possible reason for the attack was theft, say police, but they are waiting for forensic results before reaching any firm conclusions.

The boy's Austrian father

was in Europe at the time of the killing and boarded a plane straight to Thailand on hearing of his son's murder. He is also being questioned to determine possible motives.

Stolen cars head to Samui: Police in Samui have been ordered to be on the lookout for stolen cars being imported illegally

from Malaysia.

A group of three car thieves apprehended near the Thai-Malaysian border in Kota Bahru are believed to be part of a larger ring that buys cars in Malaysia under the country's leasing system us-

ing borrowed ID cards. Two of the group were Malaysian, and one was Thai.

Officers confiscated a Toyota Wish that the three suspects admitted to buying in Malaysia and were driving to sell in Thai-

"From the information received," explained Col Chaiyuth Ninlawong, Superintendent of Samui District Police Station, "the thieves generally target Toyota Wish or Altis models, which require a down payment of around

200,000 baht. They then drive the cars to Thailand, crossing the border at Perlis, Kelantan or Kedah."

Once the cars have been sold, the gang then contact insurance companies back in Malaysia and claim they have been stolen, claiming compensation of 99%, which amounts to as much as one million baht for some mod-

The models in question are now popular on Koh Samui, so police are working with the Im-

migration Department to check cars with papers from neighboring countries, some of which may have been sold cheaply to rental agencies for tourism.

Developing dispute: A legal dispute between a Thai construction firm and a foreign property developer may add further heat to the much-publicized reclamation of land and property on Samui.

Thai firm Tropical Arch Co Ltd filed a compensation claim with the Samui District Court when the foreign developer it was working for failed to pay the full amount agreed for its work.

The project in question, on

Samui's northern coast, includes both villas and apartments, with some properties on sale for more than 7 million baht.

Tropical Arch filed for 3.4 million baht in outstanding payments. After hearing the evidence, the court asked the Legal Execution Office to issue a warrant to seize funds from a bank account held by one of the developer's representatives in Thailand.

The reclaimed money amounted to some 65,000 baht, but the Thai firm says this fails to cover the amount lost and it is therefore seeking further compensation, which may include re-


claiming land or buildings.

Despite many reported disputes in the island's property sector, this is the first time that a local company has successfully sued a foreign developer. This may prove significant, both in terms of future Thai-foreign business contracts and also the outcome of other commercial conflicts on the island.

Samui has water! Chawalit Sarak, Chief of Surat Thani Provincial Water Authority, says Samui has enough reserve water to last until the next rains despite the early onset of the dry season, which meteorologists have blamed on El Niño.


On an inspection of Samui's small desalination plant, which was installed last year, K. Chawalit said that he believed existing reserves would guarantee a continuous supply. He later added, however, that the plant could be used if further resources are needed.

Samui has suffered both droughts and floods in recent years. Many people blame rampant development, which has led to the destruction of forests and created channels that allow rainwater to run off into the sea. With Songkran festival in the middle of a long dry season, local commentators say the expensive desalination process may be required.

mmigration police raided a hotel operating as a brothel in Nakhon Sri Thammarat City March 24, arresting 26 women. The brothel had reportedly been operating for more than 20 years without any police interference, according to local reports.

At 12:25 am Pol Capt Ekkachai Sidam, Deputy Investigation and Suppression Inspector at the South Region Immigration Center, led a team of five plain-clothed officers to Wiang Fah hotel, Soi Thai Hotel, Jamroenwithi Rd.

The officers preceded to the second floor and found that most of the floor's approximately 30 rooms had their doors open with attractive women sitting outside beckoning to the many would-be customers who were walking up and down the corridor. The officers then identified themselves and began to arrest the women.

A middle-aged women accompanied by two or three bouncers then approached the officers in a threatening manner. Capt Ekkachai identified himself and told the group that anyone who obstructed the officers in their duty would be arrested.

At this, the women and the bouncers turned pale and promptly retreated, leaving the officers to go about their work unhindered.

At that point officers from Nakhon Sri Thammarat Muang District Police Station, led by Superintendent Col Yanphat Narasing, arrived on the scene to help process the detainees.

Popular brothel busted



residents: Dr **Pornthip** Rojanasunan and a forensic team inspect an Islamic boarding school where three students were killed in a March 17 bomb attack. The team were allowed to enter the school after negotiations with local residents, who previously accused local officials of launching the attack and barred them from inspecting the scene.

Watchful

All of the suspects were aged between 19 and 26 years old and were reportedly Haw Chinese and hilltribe women. None had a valid Thai ID card.

All 26 were charged with prostitution. As they could not produce an ID card, they were also charged with illegal entry into the Kingdom.

Police said that they were preparing evidence to request an arrest warrant for the owner of the brothel on charges of bringing people into prostitution and housing illegal immigrants.

Locals were reported to be very critical of the raid as the Wiang Fah hotel was the last such brothel operating in the city.

Orders for the raid were reportedly given by national police chief Gen Seripisut Temeyavej to Pol Col Sayan Krasaesaen, Head of the South Region Immigration Center, without the knowledge of Nakhon Sri Thammarat Provincial Police, who only found

about it when it was already in progress.

Pugnacious pachyderms: Two elephants working in a rubber plantation in Nakhon Sri Thammarat were seriously injured March 19 after being attacked by wild elephants, members of the South's last remaining wild herd.

The elephants had been tied up for the night by their owners when the attack occurred. Thirty-year-old female Khlong was left with severe cuts to the left eye, flank and left leg, and 50-year-old female Bunhai had more than 10 tusk wounds.

Phonphirom Fungtrakul, a vet with the Southern Friends of Elephants Foundation, said that the elephants that carried out the attack usually live in Khao Nan National Park straddling Surat Thani and Nakhon Sri Thammarat provinces. "The herd is now about eight strong. The domi-

nant male is a 60-year-old who has a rather fierce nature. In the dry season, from March to May, the herd comes down to feed in the foothills. I think that the elephants were probably foraging when they came across Khlong. They then attacked her before running back into the forest before dawn. I've warned all villagers with domestic elephants to be very careful as the wild herd has probably not gone far," he


Palmed off: A well-known environmental activist was seriously injured in an assassination attempt in Surat Thani's Phanom District March 22.

As Sot Sutnak, 57, was riding his motorcycle home, a gold Isuzu pickup truck pulled up behind him and someone in the car shot him twice in the back. K. Sot fell to the ground, playing dead until his attackers left the scene. He then called for help and relatives took him to Surat Thani Hospital, where he is in a serious condition. Police also found a .357 caliber cartridge case.

Police believe the motive for the attempted killing was K. Sot's environmental work; they are paying particular attention to his opposition to palm plantations in Surat Thani and Krabi provinces.

Col Samran Majaroen, Superintendent of Phanom District Police Station, said that police cannot yet give the exact motive for the crime and are still investigating a number of leads. They are waiting to question the victim. The attackers left little evidence and no witnesses as the crime scene was in a dark and quiet soi, Col Samran added.

Cop implicated in assault case

policeman in Saraburi province has been suspended from active duty pending an investigation into his alleged role in a February 25 attack on a young karaoke bar hostess whose arm was chopped off.

The policeman, Pol Lance Corporal Nirut Thammasap, was charged with attempted murder and causing serious injuries, along with carrying a governmentowned firearm while off duty.

Lt Gen Pratchaya Sutthapreeda, chief of Provincial Police Bureau 1, said civilian Nirat Kongtham carried the knife and chopped off the victim's right arm above her elbow while he was riding pillion on a motorcycle driven by Prasarn Bundok, another civilian.

L/C Nirut was riding another motorcycle alongside them, he said.

All three were released on bail after they turned themselves over to Baan Mor Police Station, where Nirut is assigned.

Gen Pratchaya said Nirut's superior officers would also face disciplinary action for allegedly helping Nirut by distorting the facts of the investigation report to read that the victim, Suphansa Wichananant, lost her arm in a road accident.

K. Suphansa lodged a complaint with acting police chief Gen Seripisut Temiyavej because there had been no progress in the local police investigation nearly one month after the attack.

In a press interview, K. Suphansa said that the men had followed her on two motorcycles after she had left the karaoke bar to escape their sexual harassment. When his motorcycle caught up to hers, Nirat chopped off her right arm with a single swipe of a long knife.

Despite losing her arm, the singer tried to continue her escape but crashed her motorcycle and broke her right shin in three places.

K. Suphansa said that a number of Baan Mor police officers interviewed her in the hospital the morning after the attack. They dismissed her account because they claimed she was still in shock, she said.

Class action: Two years after the practice was revoked in a revised Education Ministry regulation, suspension from class will soon be in effect again as a punishment for disruptive students.

Education Permanent Secretary Jaruayphorn Thorranin said suspensions could be used against only high school and vocational school students and in extreme cases of aggression, immoral conduct or violent acts harmful to others. The duration of suspensions to be administered has not been determined but will soon be decided, K. Jaruayphorn said.

was prompted by petitions from parents whose children had been victims of violent classmates or who had suffered physical assault by students from rival schools.

A 2005 regulation had revoked suspension from class and caning, which had long been practiced in Thailand, following a series of campaigns by educators and child psychiatrists.

Mass communications: Most of the programming on Thailand's six free television channels is geared more to consumerism than toward social development, a study by Chulalongkorn University's Media Monitoring project has concluded.

Asst Prof Uajit Virojtrairatt said his survey "Do Thai TV Stations Take Audiences to Be Consumers or Citizens?" showed that 69.4% of all six channels' programs focused more on selling products than on social development. The survey covered all programs round the clock from February 1 to 7.

Channel 11 had the highest percentage of "social development" programs (86.8%), followed by Channel 9 (51.3%).

Channels 7 and 3 had the highest ratio of commercial programs. They also enjoyed the highest ratings.

The survey also showed that state-owned Channel 5

placed heavy emphasis on commercial programming.

The survey was instigated by calls from academics that it was time for Thailand to have a public television station with highquality content as an alternative to commercial programming aired to meet advertisers' needs.

Summer break danger: Statistics released by the Ramathibodi Hospital Child Safety Promotion and Injury Prevention Research Center say that more children are likely to be killed in accidents during the school holidays currently underway than any other time of the year.

The school holidays start in March and end in mid-May.

Drowning, the leading cause of accidental deaths among children, is most common in March, April and May.

"Parents need to pay close attention as young children often drown in enamel basins, water buckets, wells and other water sources near home," said the center's Director, Adisak Plitponkarnpim.

If drowning children were not rescued within five minutes, they had minimal chance of survival, he added.

Traffic accidents were another leading cause of child deaths. "On average, 65 children are killed in traffic accidents every month," he said, adding that average figures climb to 75 in March and 85 in April.

Other causes of accidental child deaths given were poisoning, falling, burns, explosions and accidental death by firearms. "On average, these causes account for about 98 child deaths a month, but the figure reaches 116 in March, 132 in April and 118 in May," he said.

Copter crash kills nine: Nine naval personnel were killed when their Bell 214 helicopter crashed in a rice field in the northeastern province of Surin on March 23, the Royal Thai Navy said.

Rear-Admiral Ruangthip Thienthon said the helicopter was one of two on a routine training flight from Ubon Ratchathani to U-Tapao naval base in Chonburi when it crashed in Surin's Rattanaburi District at about 11:45 am.

Witnesses in the other helicopter saw smoke coming from the rear engine before the helicopter crashed and exploded, R/Adm Ruangthip said.


The bodies of the crash victims were taken to U-Tapao naval base.

The two pilots were identified as Cdr Tossapol Thumwong and Lt Cdr Passakorn Rakwong.

The seven passengers were Lt Jitruti Jit-aree, Chief Petty Officer Suwit Panichwattana and petty officers Somkiet Seuyoi, Manit Khumpai, Niwat Mungsaeng, Thawal Khonnoen and Thanakorn Nuansutha.

As all died in the line of duty their families are entitled to naval benefits, he said.

Give a smile, get one back

s we all know, the streets of Patong can be real obstacle courses: potholes, vats of boiling oil, soi dogs and tangle of electric wires are just a few of the obstructions regularly encountered.

If you think its bad for you, just imagine what it must be like for disabled people.

Australians Terry Brown, Alan Cladingboel and Bob Donnelly have been coming to Patong for 12 years, during which time they have seen just how difficult it is for Phuket's disabled.

Wanting to help, the three kind tourists decided to donate mobility scooters to give 20 disabled people in Phuket a little more independence.

The scooters were presented to the lucky recipients at a March 20 ceremony at the Thara Patong Resort and Spa attended by by representatives of the Patong Beach Rotary Club, Patong Nurses' Association, Phuket Special Education Center and the Phuket Handicap Club.



had in mind would be suitable for Phuket. So last September he gave one scooter to a man named Satien, who lost both his legs in a car accident 10 years ago. After

a few test drives, K. Satien was using his scooter all the time – and it has made a big difference in his life.

"In Australia we live a good, happy life. No problems, good health. But we see too many people here with disabilities who cannot help themselves at all. The government does not have the money to help everybody, so we decided to do this. We don't want anything at all in return except a smile," Mr Brown said.

Appropriately enough, the 80,000-baht scooters are built by Smile Family (Siam) company in Bangkok. Powered by rechargeable electric batteries, they are simple to control and can be driven with just two hands because the accelerator, light, horn and brake controls are all on the steering wheel.

"There's only one company in Bangkok that makes this scooter. I tried to find them in Phuket when I came here in March last year, but I couldn't. When I went home I looked on the Internet and found an electric car company in Bangkok that makes the golf carts, tuk-tuks and many models of scooters. They also have electric wheelchairs. This company exports many scooters to Japan, but because they are so expensive people here cannot afford them," he said.

"The reason we chose to buy scooters is because electric wheelchairs don't really give people the kind of mobility they need. But with scooters, they can travel at 12 kilometers an hour. If they want to go to the shop, they can go and come back in five minutes," he added.

With the help of Smile Family Co, which sold the scooters to Mr Brown and his friends at half-price, the Australians were able to donate more scooters than they thought.

"We would like to buy even more. Maybe we will do this again. I have spoken with a Swedish man here who said that he will go back to tell his people. Maybe they will also do the same next year. This is good, because the tourists want to give something back to people here," he said.

Mr Brown said the reason he and his friends did this was to help these people – and to see the smile on their faces.

"Any time you see people here who are disadvantaged and poor, they are all very sad. Giving them money doesn't necessarily help, because they might not know how to use the money wisely. But with something like this they will be able to use for a very long time," he added.

One scooter recipient was 14-year-old Anisa Ratso, who has suffered from muscular dystrophy in her legs since she was 10. She can't walk very well and has fallen down many times, sometimes breaking bones. Her mother Suthida said that she would like for Anisa to spend her life as normal children do and the family is trying their best to help her.

"We are happy that she will have chance to go out and visit many more places because of this scooter and she can see the world outside our home," said K.Suthida.

The scooter has been especially helpful in allowing her to continue her studies through Phuket's Non-Formal Education Center.

"If she doesn't learn, she will be a child without a future, which is not fair to her because she is clever girl," K. Suthida said.

Apaporn Chaiyasat, a 22-year-old who has suffered muscular dystrophy since birth, graduated from high school at the Non-Formal Education Center Phuket. Now living with her grandmother in Phuket Villa 3, she is planning to take a ciomputer course in Pattaya in April.

"I'm happy to get this scooter. It will make my life so much easier. For example, now I will be able to drive to buy something for my grandmother in the village," she said.

Wimonrat Khocharoen, Head Nurse at the Emergency Room of Patong Hospital, was responsible for choosing the scooter recipients, all of whom come from Patong and Phuket City

"We have projects to help the disabled in many communities. In deciding who should get these scooters, we screened people to see who would benefit most from having them. Single leg amputees are common candidates, as are people with congenital or acquired disorders that have left them unable to walk," she said.

There are still about 10 handicapped people in Kamala area who need scooters to bring smiles to their faces, she said.

BOMBAY CONNECTION

ndian cuisine is tremendously popular in Britain and many other countries, but mention the words *ahaan khaek* (Indian food) in Phuket and most non-Muslim Thais will screw their faces up, making gestures as if they are pinching their nose shut or wafting away a bad smell.

The reason? Most Thais will tell you that there is an oddly unpleasant aroma to Indian food.

But there is one big exception to this: *roti*, a fried wheat paste topped with sugar and sweetened condensed milk, or sometimes with banana, fruit jams or other toppings.

Popular all across South and Southeast Asia, *roti* is popular in Bangkok as well as Bombay, and just about everywhere in between

The original plain *roti* from India is eaten as a staple with curries, much as Thais eat rice with meals. In Phuket, the two most basic options are with egg or without, but there is also a variety of fillings and toppings to choose from that vary from vendor to vendor.

Roti are cooked on a large, flat iron griddle, most often at a roadside stall. Many roti vendors also sell mataba, which is a sort of stuffed roti.

To experience the full range of the *roti*, *mataba* and other popular Indian and Muslim foods, a trip to Rotee Lovers on Chao Fa West Rd is a must.

Rotee Lovers was opened last December by owners Shalisa "Yui" Prinyanusorn and her sister-in-law Wanida "Ae" Patan, whose mother Mabuba provides the recipes and oversees the kitchen.

"Our restaurant has about 100 seats, half of which are outdoor for evening dining. We have both Thai and foreign customers. Some are Muslim, some not. Our goal is to offer delicious and affordable Muslim foods in a relaxing, spacious atmosphere. We find many Muslim restaurants are too cramped and dark," K. Yui said.

"When we first opened, we targeted customers in nearby areas. But now people are coming from everywhere in Phuket. We have customers who come from Surin Beach to try our food. They

hear of us by word of mouth," she said.

"Our menu starts with *roti* and *mataba*, we have plain *roti* that can be eaten with many different curries. We also have *roti* with sweet toppings, such as sugar, banana, raisins or sweetened

milk. We have *mataba* stuffed with chicken, beef or tuna," said K. Yui, adding that as a Muslim restaurant there is no pork on the menu.

Rotee Lovers also has salads: *salat khaek* (green salad with peanut dressing), tuna salad and chicken salad with Thousand Island dressing.

"We also have many different curries. One popular item is beef or chicken stew on rice. Our *khao mok gai* [yellow rice steamed with marinated chicken] is another big seller," she said.

Two hard-to-find Muslim dishes at Rotee Lovers are *kuay tiew gaeng* (noodles in curry soup) and *gurama* curry (Indian beef curry). They also offer an Italian-Indian hybrid that you won't see too many menus: spaghetti in curry soup.

"All of our curries use special seasonings that we buy in Bangkok," K Yui said.

The most popular selection on the 50-item menu is the *masaman* curry. Made using K. Mabuba's special recipe, a huge batch is prepared each day to meet demand. Other popular choices include oxtail soup and omelets.

One of the newest additions to the menu is the "roti puff". Invented about two months ago, it uses a special frying method and extra-think *roti* dough to produce a crispy fried outside and sweet, chewy inside that is perfect with ice cream or blueberry jam.

Rotee Lovers carries a selection of ice-creams, sorbets and beverages from Iberry ice-cream in Bangkok as well as fresh fruit punch.

The price for plain *roti* is 15 baht each, and *mataba* is a reasonable 35 baht per portion. A serving of *khao mok kai* will set you back 40 baht, while rice and curry dishes are 50 baht.

Rotee Lovers is on Chao Fa West Rd, about 200 meters south of Kajonkietsuksa School in Wichit. Open daily from noon to 3 pm and 4:30 pm to 9 pm. Closed Fridays. For more information call 089-8970131, 085-9050707 or 081-5514200.



THE PIANO

Timmy Cicero was playing the baby grand piano at Dusit Laguna's classy Horizon cocktail lounge late one recent Thursday. Every seat was taken – a rare thing for such a venue, where patrons usually pause only because they are waiting for someone or something.

But Jimmy is far from usual; a musician of rare musicality, he packs 'em in nightly.

A group of hip-looking Germans pulled up closer to the piano while he intoned the refrain to *Breaking Up is Hard to Do*, one of his best tunes. Jimmy has a voice that belies his 69-kilogram, 168-centimeter frame: a silky tenor like Tony Bennett's that never strains. His delivery, moreover, has arguably more cojones than that of Mel Torme, called the greatest voice in jazz.

The German group were regulars: "Hoo! Jimmy," they called out, applauding, then lamenting audibly as he announced that the next number would be his last for the evening. "I hope to see you all again tomorrow night," he said, pretending to ignore their dismay, then tried to close with the suggestively titled *I Want to Go Home*.

"Hey, Jimmy! One more," one of them called. The Horizon was still full, but it was closing time. "I'm sorry, that was my last song," replied Jimmy.

"No. One more. What do you like to play? Play us your favorite!"

He relented, closing with Jesse Belvin's lush, charmingly romantic *Goodnight My Love*.

Jimmy is 60. He's lived some pleasant dreams over the years – admits to rough times as well – but is always hoping for a sunnier, brighter tomorrow.

Like many famous singers, Jimmy is an American of Italian heritage. "But we're not an East Coast Italian family," he said, explaining that the famous ones are associated with New York.

Hayward, California, on the other hand, Jimmy's home, has

been associated not with singers but with canned fruit, ironwork and electrical equipment.

That might have been different had Jimmy struck a different chord, so to speak. He might have done for Hayward what The Beatles did for Liverpool. His beginnings were promising enough

Hayward is just southeast of San Francisco. The famous bay forms a kind of inland sea between the stately city and its less scenic suburbs. Industrial Hayward is an ocean away in terms of status from San Francisco and its Renaissance Revival opera house.

Yet there are bridges across the bay and the cultural divide might not be too great for an enterprising youth with a good voice, a knack for keyboards and the gift of gab.

"I started playing piano and singing professionally when I was about 12," he recalled. His mother encouraged him to take piano lessons as a child.

"My first gig was singing at a church dance." That was in 1957, two years after Elvis Presley's emergence and three years into the rock 'n' roll era.

On Jimmy's side of the bay, rock ruled but Elvis wasn't king. There, R&B artist Chuck Berry, a defiantly twangy black guitarist from nearby Oakland, had shot to fame. Berry thumbed his nose, musically, at Beethoven and Tin

Pan Alley, singing his own unvarnished lyrics.

His music, like that of Fats Domino, Ray Charles and Sam Cooke, spawned a movement that transformed how white artists played. Jimmy Cicero was among the seminal group of white Bay Area R&B performers.

Rolling Stone magazine critic Michael Rozek in a November 1974 review of Tower of Power's album Ain't Nothin' Stoppin' Us Now noted that the band's leader, Emilio Castillo, and its white members were part of a mass Bay Area "white-lovefor-soul-music" trend about 1967. Rozek, however, thought "a white 'horn band' called the Spiders playing Curtis Mayfield and Gene Chandler tunes" had greater influence.

"But who showed the Spiders their schtick? Maybe another local white named Jimmy Cicero..." Cicero, Rozek averred, was perhaps the first white kid to "cop black licks 'round Hayward".


As a teenager, Jimmy developed playing local clubs and dances. Although he describes his style now as a "a mixture of jazz and soft pop", he started as a rock 'n' roll singer: "I was lucky 'cause I could always sing," he drawled disarmingly, "even though I had kinda neglected my piano."

"I started to put on dances, and eventually owned my own teenage nightclub when I was 18. It was in Hayward and was called Cicero's."

That was not the first time he would trade on his surname, which might come straight from a Sinatra film. If you Google his name, however, you will find that a more Internet-savvy professional wrestler dominates the first page of hits.

During the late '60s, Jimmy had a six-piece R&B band "and played the Hammond organ". Back then organs weren't drowned out by electric guitars and required no tricky mic technique to avoid feedback noise on stage. Listeners loved 'em.

Hammonds are regarded as



having a classic sound. Billy Preston played one on The Beatles' timeless Let It Be.

"My first Hammond was an M-1 spinet," Jimmy noted, "but after a couple of years I moved up to a B-3," the Rolls-Royce of electric organs.

Having turned 21, he hooked up with popular Bay Area artists Stan Cristo and The Casuals: "I worked with them for a couple years and was fortunate to have great press coverage."

Oakland Tribune entertainment columnist Perry Phillips took a shine to him: "He always mentioned my name... We be-

good came friends.'

Having achieved local hero status, Jimmy expanded his group to six pieces. The Summer of Love came and went but the Bay Area remained a hotbed of musical invention. "Those days," he recalled, "were a lot of fun."

"For a long time" he "played right next door" to Tower of Power. He also sat-in with Santana for six or seven concerts during their peak.

That was a great experience," he said. Later he played with Chuck Berry.

Then, in 1971, aged 24, he moved to Reno, a resort town near Lake Tahoe, straddling the California-Nevada border. Fueled by gambling revenue, it was and still is a magnet for entertainers.

Jimmy stayed there for 17 years, playing clubs and casinos and opening his second Cicero's as a restaurant and nightclub. It was steady money.

Tower of Power, meanwhile, got album contracts and regular reviews in Rolling Stone, reaching icon status.

Then Jimmy became interd in jazz: "I actually played a lot of jazz in Reno. For many years I had a B-3 trio – organ, sax and drums." He played bass with the organ pedals. "I toured with Rick Nelson and the Stone Canyon band for about a year and a half."

Pretty-boy TV star Nelson, of Ozzie and Harriet fame, had been fielded as a substitute heartthrob for teenage girls while Elvis served in the army during the late

In 1989, Jimmy moved again. This time to Scottsdale, Arizona, where he opened entertainment agency Jimmy Cicero Music Productions, and stayed five years.

"I have always written a lot of music, and although I have not had a lot of luck getting it placed, I was fortunate to get three songs in a major motion picture, Francis Ford Coppola's The Floren-

The songs, two bossa nova numbers and a ballad, were Here You Are, I Love Your Smile and People Like You, People Like

The past decade has seen Jimmy in transition. He became a licensed real estate agent in California, then decided to try his

> luck in farther flung: "I spent a short time in Istanbul and that had a profound effect. I've written many pieces of music based on my visit and on study of Turkish history."

Seizing on Thailand, Jimmy came to Phuket and started Phuket Paradise Properties. But property sales could never replace music, so Jimmy cast round for gigs and discovered... dearth. "There're not too many places to play this kind of music," he said.

So he's more than happy about the gig at the Dusit, where he plays Tuesday to Saturday. They've signed him for the rest of the year: "It's my kinda place."

He keeps the customers fied, playing music by, among others, Michael Franks, Billy Joel, Elton John and Johnny Mercer – but nothing remotely Turkish.

Perhaps, like many, he's found the groove he really likes. "I don't miss the US... in Phuket, and in my heart, I feel like I've found my true home."

To find a musician of Jimmy's caliber playing in a Phuket lobby lounge is so remarkable that it brings to mind the final two lines of Piano Man:

And they sit at the bar and put bread in my jar

And say, man, what are you doin' here?



lthough Toyota has the lion's share of the lucrative pickup market, Mitsubishi has in recent years launched an effective attack on the market leader, initially with its Strada and then, more recently, with its attractive Triton model.

The Triton is available with a range of cabs – as are its competitors – but has a wider choice of engine options, starting with a 2.5-liter turbo diesel producing a modest 88bhp (65kW) and 196 Nm of torque up to a top-of-theline model with a 3.2-liter common-rail diesel delivering a healthy 162bhp and a massive 350Nm peak torque.

Mitsubishi has been in the news recently, taking its eighth consecutive Dakar Rally win. Stephane Peterhansel took his ninth victory – six on two wheels and now three in cars – ahead of fellow Frenchman and 2006 winner Luc Alphand.

Although there had been a number of different stage winners, including entries from Volkswagen, Hummer, BMW and even Ford of France's unique Buggy driven by former Dakar winner and one-time Grand Prix driver Jean-Louis Schlesser, it was the strong Mitsubishi team that came through in the end.

The 29th Dakar Rally took place at the beginning of January, starting from Lisbon and heading through Spain, Morocco, Mauritania and Mali before arriving in Senegal and the beautiful desert city of Dakar.

This year's event was marred by the death of two motorcyclists. Since the first Dakar rally in 1978, 50 people involved in the race have died, half of them competitors.

The adventure began in 1977. Frenchman Thierry Sabine got lost on his motorcycle in the Libyan desert during the Abidjanto-Nice rally. After being rescued from the sands, he returned to France defeated by the extreme landscapes. He then promised himself that he would share this

discovery with as many as possible and lived for a single goal: take a maximum number of people into the immensity of the sand.

The first rally took place the following year starting in Europe. The route then continued to Algiers before crossing Agadez and ultimately to Dakar.

The Paris-Dakar rally, as it was then known, opened up an unknown world, one in which professionals and amateurs alike could take part.

This year more than 500 crew members took part in this near-8,000-kilometer adventure, of which more than half consists

of timed special stages, sometimes in sandstorms, sometimes in the dark. That so many competitors return every year for what must be one of the last big motorsport challenges in the world says a great deal about Sabine's vision all those years ago. Sadly the Frenchman died in a helicopter crash during the 1986

Apart from the rigors of the Dakar, the more humble Mitsubishi vehicles also have a reputation for ruggedness and reliability and the Thai-built Triton is no exception. The model made its debut in 2005 in Thailand and is now exported to a number of countries, including, amazingly enough, Japan. To tie in neatly with the Dakar successes, the Triton has large fender flares and clear visual links with the Dakar Pajero model.

On the 4WD versions, an Easy Select transfer box enables the driver to switch from 2WD to 4WD "on the fly", while the rear differential incorporates a limited-slip system to provide extra traction on slippery surfaces.

Mitsubishi, one of the smallest of the Japanese automakers, has recently reported a slump in sales in its Asian markets, notably Indonesia, Malaysia and Taiwan, and even in Australia, which is generally resistant to financial woes. Here in Thailand, though, the company is enjoying strong sales of all models, but in particular, the Triton pickup.

Prices start at 440,000 baht for the entry-level, single-cab 2WD model; 628,000 baht for the least expensive 4WD model; rising to 898,000 baht for the topof-the-range 3.2-liter automatic, 4WD double-cab Triton GLS.

ow does someone design costumes for a beautiful, fantastic ladyboy show in Phuket? Well,

for a start, it helps to be a ladyboy, of course.

Dechawut Chuntakaro has been in the stage's spotlight for more than 20 years, so you might know her better as "Khun Day Freeman".

She is often seen on TV, and you may even recognize her from the posters that are popping up all over Phuket, advertising her stage production The Most Fantastic Beautiful Man Show.

K. Day personally designs and oversees the making of all the costumes for her shows. "Our costume style is more based on fashion than glamor," she explains, "but what designs and materials are used in making stage costumes depends on the venue and the budget available, and other elements, too.

"At this show we are not stressing the use of makeup and we are not using 'stage makeup'. We are using a more natural style that is not too dark or too thick.

"Everything we are doing with this show is more based on fashion trends; our costumes look more like styles than costumes," says K. Day.

With several shows weekly and lots of movement by performers not just on stage but out among the audience as well, the glitzy costumes can start to show wear and tear. K. Day says that they often completely replace costumes when they are worn out

"It costs nearly the full price of the outfit to have it repaired, so it is not worth it. We also do this for the accessories," she says, adding that keeping a highend wardrobe is not cheap.

"For example, the dress I am wearing now I designed myself, and I embroidered it by hand. It cost about 20,000 baht to make because I used a lot of shiny glass beads," she explains.

K. Day believes that costumes must appeal to her audience. "I need my audiences to be touched by this strange, fantastic show. We transform a normal man into a beautiful man. Before seeing our show some people never knew that a man can be a 'beautiful man'," K. Day says.

However, K. Day has no aspirations to climb into commercial design. In fact, she has little interest in it.

"My costumes are designed only for show. I'm not creating designs for commercial use; the styles used in making costumes for shows should be different. However, it is easy for one field of design to start using designs from another field, so every stylist must be careful."

Most of the materials she uses are imported in order to get a better selection of color and style, but K. Day is strict in making sure that materials are good quality, especially bird feathers. "Fabric can be either synthetic or







"I don't have favorite colors or styles because I design for other people. I base my costumes' styles on music, such as Brazilian music, and use many bird feathers or big accessories to make the costumes colorful. If the costume is in an Asian style, I emphasize the golden tones to create a holy and 'solid' look.



For example, the Chedi's signature treatments use the resort's own natural products, and the aromatherapy oils are based on the four elements Earth, Wind, Water and Fire.

K. Say tells me that the Chedi Massage is the premier signature treatment. Combining a Swedish massage with a sport massage, it focuses on pressure points to soothe tired muscles and increase circulation.

"We want to take care of our guests like a mother takes care of her child," she explains.

On that note the Chedi also offers a Junior Massage for children eight to 12 years old. K. Say explains that it is a gentle massage, allowing parents to share a relaxing spa experience with their children.

I select the two-hour Chedi Rejuvenation package at 3,950 baht and off we go to the treatment rooms. I follow K. Say up the walkway that Thai movie stars and beauty queens have trod before me. The path weaves through the jungle before coming to several small bungalows overlooking the pristine beach.

There are four treatment rooms, two double and two single. I'm led to a double treatment rooms with private outdoor bath.

Phave finally taken up my New Year's resolution to be healthier and to work out, but it's not easy to stick to ad my evening yoga classes brought a few sore morn-

Through a glass door lie two massage beds.

My treatment begins with a footbath and a Swedish massage, which increases blood flow and circulation as the strokes and movements of the masseuse are away from the heart.

My therapist brings a tray holding the four aromatherapy oils. She explains to me the scent of each one and what it is supposed to awaken in my senses. Earth is a blend of patchouli and Thai *prai* to relieve tension; Wind is made of bergamot and orange peel to refresh the senses; Water is a mix of lavender and geranium for moisturizing; and Fire is eucalyptus and rosemary, to improve circulation.

I choose Earth, disrobe, wrap myself with a large fluffy bath towel and settle onto the end of the treatment bench. I plunge my tootsies into a warm bath and my therapist pulls out a scrub brush. I grimace, why did I choose a foot bath? I have probably the most sensitive feet ever...

But unlike other pedicurelike treatments I've had, this doesn't tickle or make me pull away; the movements are light and gentle. I lay back on the table with relief as I roll over for the massage.

As I'm lulled into a relaxed euphoria, I realize that there have been no breaks in sensation during my massage. My therapist skillfully moves around me without breaking the rhythm of the massage. Impressive.

After my back, legs, arms, feet, neck, chest, stomach, head are all kneaded into relaxation, I hop into a warm shower outside

while a warm bath is prepared for me. Soothing oils have been poured into the black granite tub

and flowers are floating on top. I climb in and lie back to watch the palm trees above me. Heaven.

My therapist comes out with a pot of hot ginger tea and a tray of shortbread cookies. I feel my heart sink a little when she says she will be back in 15 minutes; I think I could stay right here the rest of the afternoon.

But I have to get out and move on to my facial. I know, it's a rough life. My skin is soft and oil-free as I pat myself dry before climbing back onto the massage table.

The facial is the grand finale of this package. I select an Aroma Cleansing Facial to rehydrate my parched skin. I lay back and close my eyes while a cooling mist is sprayed over my face and neck and then several different cleansers are used.


Next a gentle scrub is rubbed on in little circular motions. My therapist uses a warm towel to wipe off the scrub before another round of cleansing begins.


All throughout the facial she uses gentle pressure to massage my face and neck. A facial mask is applied with a soft brush. After my face is cleansed and moisturized, my scalp is treated to a nice massage.

I sit up as my therapist links her arms in mine, twisting my back around working out the last of the kinks that last night's yoga didn't. Then, using her forearms, she works out the few remaining knots in my shoulders that were left over after the massage.

I feel so full of energy after this package that I bound off to the beach for a late afternoon swim. When I arrive at the beach, my companions ask what I've done today because my skin is glowing. I didn't hesitate to let them in on my little secret – an afternoon at The Chedi.

hen you mention Koh Jum, most people's first question is, "Where?" It's not yet on many tourist maps and few travelers make it there.

Koh Jum is about 25 kilometers to the south of Krabi and is easily reached by the twicedaily ferry boats en route to Koh Lanta. About an hour out of the port of Krabi, the ferry stops and longtail boats arrive in the middle of the bay - and a few knowledgeable travelers jump ship.

The northern areas of the island, known locally as "Koh Pu", are rocky, rugged and covered in jungle and small rubber plantations. The southern areas of the island are flatter and the beaches are surrounded by natural vegetation, such as casuarina trees. As on Phuket and Koh Lanta, accommodation is found mainly on the west coast.

This is a very quiet island and certainly not for those looking to party and enjoy the bar life.

There are no paved roads or cars and getting around is not easy, the main options being walking or taking a motorbike taxi. Every bungalow or resort has its own version of these – so it's no problem if you do wish to explore.

There are a few motorcycles to rent for self drive also. A word of warning, however: check the brakes first.

There is no mains electrici-


either sophisticated enough to have their own generators or are still very small and romantically inclined and rely on kerosene

A poor tale of Edgar Allan Poe

very schoolboy knows that Edgar Allan Poe came to a bad end, dead of drink or delirium in Baltimore in 1849 at the age of 40. What's unknown is the exact cause of his death amid mysterious circumstances.

The conceit in Matthew Pearl's *The* Poe Shadow (Random House, New York, 2006, 433pp) is that a rich young Baltimore lawyer named Quentin Clark, a great admirer and correspondent of Poe, takes up his case and devotes the next couple years into unraveling the secrets surrounding his death.

This is a great narrative hook but Matthew Pearl, alas, doesn't have the literary chops to pull it off. When it comes to characterization, dialog, description and plot, he is woefully inept.

Quentin Clark is a cipher. He writes in an archaic early 19th century prose that comes off as simply stilted. He is engaged to another cipher, the virginal and vacuous Hattie Blum. But then, in his obsession with Poe's death, he tears off to Paris in search of Auguste Duponte, supposedly the real-life version of C Auguste Dupin, hero of Poe's detective stories (and forerunner, as Alfred Conan Doyle would later admit, of Sherlock Holmes). The idea is to bring him back to Baltimore and put him on the case of Edgar Allan Poe.


The mysterious bits are Poe's whereabouts in the last four days of his life. Supposedly he was to travel from Richmond



 where he had recently taken a temperance pledge and became engaged to be married - to Philadelphia to edit a rich lady's poems and then to New York to pick up the mother of his late wife and bring her back to Richmond where he proposed setting up a new literary magazine, The Stylus.

Instead, he's found in a seedy tavern in Baltimore, stark raving out of his mind, wearing someone else's ill-fitting clothes. A doctor friend transports him to a hospital where he raves on and on about someone called "Reynolds" until he dies.

This is the case Clark presents to Auguste Duponte in Paris. If anything Duponte is more a cipher than Clark. With a vacant stare and preoccupied mind, Duponte spends his time studying newspapers in his room and wandering the streets of Paris. He resists Clark's entreaties to take on the case of Poe.



Now enters the Devil in the form of "Baron" Claude Dupin, noted lawyer and charlatan, who claims to be the real Dupin. He has snuck into Paris from London, where he'd gone to ground to dodge creditors, with his beautiful henchwoman and bodyguard Bonjoir. These two liven up the novel for a bit, but then it's back to the dreary treadmill of a plot.

The plot depends on those two hoary

19th century devices of wild coincidence and eavesdropped conversations. Clark is constantly stumbling across just the people he is looking for and then sneaking up to listen in their conversations. He does this a half dozen times with Baron Dupin and Bonjoir alone, once resorting – oh give me a break – to a rat-infested dumbwaiter.

Still you keep grimly turning pages waiting for the grand revelations that Duponte is supposed to bring forth. While the Baron races around Baltimore interviewing witnesses and concocting a sinister, violent plot against Poe, Duponte sits in his room poring over newspaper clippings. Then before the Baron is to give his public lecture to reveal all, he is shot on stage. And Clark is accused and thrown in jail, though he's nowhere near a gun. And Bonjoir kisses him with an opiate that sends him to the prison infirmary, the wall of which fall apart in a rainstorm, allowing Clark to escape. And then...

The big courtroom scene! Duponte hires a vagrant to fire a pistol that empties the court, leaving Clark conveniently alone so Duponte can reveal the results of his research. He could have just tapped him on the shoulder but no... And the staggering revelations? Mush.

Matthew Pearl has written another 19th century literary thriller called *The* Dante Club, starring Longfellow, James Russell Lowell and Oliver Wendel Holmes. I'll definitely miss the hat-trick.

Pipe dreams

Unexpected heavy rainfall during what is statistically one of Phuket's driest months, March, has once again averted water shortages and given officials from the various water-supply agencies cause to sigh with relief.

Fortunately, the recent downpours did not result in any major flooding, as often happens after months of low rainfall when debris accumulates in drains and causes blockages.

Instead, the rain in many areas seemed to come in just the right amounts and intensity to clean out drainpipes and wash away their accumulated detritus – in most areas straight into the sea.

This has made the heavy rain a mixed blessing on some parts of the island, most notably Patong, which has virtually no capacity to store or make use of the naturally-purified water that falls from the sky – other than as a drain cleaning agent.

The island's undisputed mass-tourism and nightlife hub, Patong has been a victim of its own success in recent months as indicated by the overwhelming stench emanating from its sewers.

The second-phase sewage treatment plant and an innovative "constructed wetland" that was opened next to it last October are obviously incapable of treating all the wastewater. During heavy rainfalls, the treatment system's storage capacity can be overwhelmed, causing the flow of untreated sewage to flow straight into the bay with the rainwater in what is know as "combined runoff".

So while the latest rainfall may have lessened the stench from the sewers, it simply transferred much of the offending muck into Patong Bay, home of Phuket's most popular beach and also some species of seaweed and diatoms reported as found only in Patong. Is it any wonder that fewer and fewer people dare to swim in Patong Bay in the high season?

The Democrat Party recently called on the interim government to increase the budget for the 14 southern provinces to compensate for years of underfunding under former PM Thaksin, who at one point explicitly warned that constituencies that failed to support his Thai Rak Thai party could expect smaller budgets.

Nowhere are greater budget increases needed than in Patong, which desperately requires a sewage system separate from its storm drains, not to mention underground power lines and a range of other infrastructure improvements.

Given the municipality's tiny registered population, such upgrades would be well beyond the municipality's capacity to fund on its own - even if it weren't wasting much of its existing budget on nonessential activities aimed more at pleasing voters than truly serving the people by preserving the environment. - The Editor

THE GRIM REAPER IS STILL WINNING

he number of injuries and deaths on Phuket's – and all of Thailand's roads continues to climb in spite of government campaigns to reduce the number of accidents, and Phuket is usually in the top five provinces for the number of accidents.

There are 12,000 to 13,000 people killed every year from accidents in Thailand and most of them are employed. These workers earn an income of 200,000 to 300,000 baht per year so if they can live for another 30 years they will create an income of around 70 to 80 billion baht for our country, so why shouldn't the government solve this problem? The cost to society not just in lives, but even in productivity and money is too great to not act.

The government has shown us through projects like the new traffic control measures taken at the Heroines Monument that they can decrease accidents if they take action. If people can not discipline themselves then the government must step in and create order out of the chaos.

At Vachira Hospital the monthly death toll from accidents is usually 10 to 12 people, as many as 300 injured. Sometimes 15 are killed in one month. The numbers are going up, not down.

The 30 people who died from the bus fire in Saraburi form another example of poor discipline. Many of our government officials have visited foreign countries where they have seen how the rules and regulations work to provide social order and safety and help create a good life. Why can't the government take those ideas and modify them to do something in Thailand?

would be helpful too. I remember the government talking about building a paired railway and motorway around Thailand for a budget of 80,000 million baht about ten years ago – but it hasn't happened.

Another important issue is the number of vehicles on the roads. The reason that most people buy private cars is because using public transportation isn't convenient. The OrBorJor's green buses here don't provide good service. They don't come on time and only pass by once an hour at best. You can't blame people for not using a service that is so inconvenient.

When I was in Belgium the buses there came on time and the buses passed by every five minutes. But not here. In Belgium there were many electric trams that ran together with other vehicles. I wish we had that tram on King Rama 5 Road in Bangkok. Most foreign cities have similar systems that run in conjunction with the regular traffic, and help reduce traffic and keep things

People always think about the results first and then use the causes to explain the result. The traffic problem is up to the government to fix. When the train takes 13 hours to get to Bangkok and doesn't even come to Phuket, how can we blame people for buying their own vehicles? The government needs to build bigger trains that can run at 120 to 150 kilometers per hour and get people to and from where they want

Another thing I want the government to do is to limit the speed of motorbikes. People don't follow the speed limits, so

we should ask motorcycle manufacturers to limit their top speed to 80km/hr. This is a better method than passing a law that no one will follow.

In Singapore, vehicles have an alarm that goes off when they exceed a certain speed and this helps limit speeding. We should do that with motorbikes too, as 80% of people killed in accidents here are riding motorbikes – and most of them are of working age. The cost to our society is too great to lose these people.

Human behavior is too hard to control so we have to find ways to improve safety by limiting the speed of vehicles and providing other convenient options for people to use.

Every holiday the government has campaigns to prevent accidents. The "don't drink and drive" program is a good example. These campaigns can help but they can't do it all. Not all accidents are from drinking and driving. We have to take stronger action.

My son studies at Prince of Songkhla University at the Songkhla campus. He wanted to drive a motorbike so I made him get a motorcycle license first. But after only one week he had an accident. He wasn't seriously injured, but it made me realize that our children and family members could be killed at any time.

One thing that would help with motorbikes and bicycles would be to have a special lane that is separated from traffic by at least one meter, similar to what they do in the Netherlands.

These are my suggestions to the government and I hope they will do what needs to be done – to help reduce this serious problem.

Whether the applicant will be granted a multiple-entry visa or not depends on the documents they present, such as a valid work permit, and the reliability of the company that is sponsoring them.

Pairoh Jeawae, an Officer at the Thai Consulate in Kota Bharu replies:

At Kota Bharu we do not issue multiple-entry visas. The most we can offer is a doubleentry non-immigrant visa, which allows two stays in the Kingdom of up to 90 days per stay.

Pramote Pramoonsab, Consul at the Thai Consulate in Penang replies:

We haven't actually stopped issuing one-year multiple-entry non-immigrant visas but we suggest that foreigners who already have a non-immigrant visa ask for an extension to their permit to stay at their local Immigration Office. They don't need to come to the Penang consulate.

Generally, we issue singleentry visas. Immigration Offices in Thailand can then extend a person's permit to stay depending on the documents presented.

Penchan Boonhok, from the **Phuket Provincial Labor Of**fice replies:

If a foreigner has worked for more than six months then we can update the work period on page five of their work permit to show one year.

We can put a stamp in the back of the book showing it has been extended to one year.

I agree that it can be disturbing being labeled as being a member of a group solely based on our physical characteristics, but it happens to all of us!

You have chosen to live in Thailand, so, unfortunately, you hear it rather often. When I was living abroad, I was frequently referred to as "Asian" by those who did not know me.

I have several African friends who say that they don't consider it rude to be called "black"; it is merely descriptive. Indeed, they are proud of being

Perhaps I can ease your

concern by saying that "farang" is not a rude word in Thai. It is merely our language's description of a Caucasian, a white-skinned

Linguists believe that farang came into our language either from the Persian word Farangi, which means "foreigner", or the French word

These are reasonable theories, as both of these nationalities were among the first Caucasians who came to trade and live in

We refer to darker-skinned Asians, such as those from Pakistan, India, Malaysia, Sri Lanka

and Indonesia as khaek which literally means "guest".

In my experience, any "rudeness" comes solely from the intention and intonation of the speaker. "Asian" or farang or "black" or khaek can be either politely descriptive or rude, depending upon the context and situation.

It is, in my opinion, very difficult to ask people to abandon their linguistic habits. It doesn't matter whether they are Thais or Caucasians trying to be "politically correct".




oped our own hierarchy, not dissimilar from that of a herd.

Below the nerds are a motley bunch of eclectics. The eclectics can be divided into several different sub-groups. There are the crazies, who like blowing things up and spend each day searching for wacky new ways to get adrenalin highs.

Then there are the Goths – alarming folk with pale skin, waxy hair dyed black or purple, who dress in black cloaks, fishnet

stockings and freakishly massive boots and listen to death metal music.

And there is the "emo" set, the highly emotional and melancholic who are to be avoided on their moodiest days because one never knows what they might do.

Some of these teens become famous by the time they reach their 20s by starting bands.

n my last column I went over details about the One Stop Visa and Work Permit Center in Bangkok, which I discussed briefly at an International Business Association of Phuket (IBAP) meeting a few weeks ago.

In this column I'd like to go into more detail about Internet access – which I believe is Phuket's premiere "ICT Infrastructure" challenge. Next week I'll tackle several topics that were raised by the audience.

Everywhere I go, the question I hear the most, over and over again (for more than six years now) is "how do I get a decent Internet connection?" I gave a presentation on that very topic last month at a Rotary Club of Patong Beach meeting. Some of the details have changed since I gave that presentation, but the general conclusions stand.

In short, the most consistently fast Internet connection that I've used is the CAT ADSL line – a line that's installed by CAT specifically for ADSL. You can't use it for a phone line. CAT ADSL costs 2.600 baht a month. which is a princely price by international standards, but the CAT line at my Sandwich Shoppe in Patong consistently runs 1,200 to 1,600 kilobits per second (Kbps) download speed, by far the fastest connection I've encountered. To get a CAT ADSL line, go to the CAT office on Phang Nga Road in Phuket City, or Aroonsom Plaza near Andaman Beach Suites in Patong. CAT doesn't "oversubscribe" their lines, and you may have to wait several weeks (or months) to get connected.

The second fastest connection I've encountered in Phuket comes from the CAT EV-DO "AirCard." It uses CDMA telephone technology. I've talked about the limitations of the card before – it's been discontinued by the manufacturer; at 13,000 baht, it ain't cheap; and you need a PCMCIA slot (if you own a desk-

top PC without a PCMCIA slot, I have a couple adapters left at the Sandwich Shoppe).

The AirCard works most

places in Phuket and many places in Thailand, outside of Bangkok. At 400 to 600 Kbps downloads

and 599 baht per month, it's fast and cheap to operate. Reader AV advises that he's found a wireless router in Phuket that uses the AirCard for its Internet connection – so you can set up your own wireless network with fast Internet, bypassing the telephone lines. The shops in Phuket with the routers were sold out last I heard; I'll let you know if I find any "in the wild".

The third fastest connection (no, I'm not a shill for CAT) I know about uses the CAT desktop telephone. This CDMA-based telephone looks and acts just like a regular desktop telephone – except you don't need to plug it into a phone line. Attach your computer to the phone via a USB cable, and you can expect 150 Kbps or so, which isn't great, but it runs rings around most other services.

(Update: On March 8, *The Nation* ran an article saying, "CAT Telecom's board yesterday resolved to engage an independent appraiser to evaluate the assets of Hutchison CAT Wireless Multimedia and CAT CDMA.

Piriya Siribon, CAT board spokesman, said the appraisal would answer whether Hutchison should take over CAT CDMA, or the other way round." Both CAT and Hutchison have been running CDMA networks in Thailand. Presumably, consolidat-

ing the two networks – which is expected by the end of the year – will extend CDMA

and "DO" coverage throughout the country.)

The general speed of landline ADSL has improved over the years, but it has a long way to go. For example, at this moment my nominal 1 Mbps (= 1,000 Kbps) TT&T ADSL line is delivering 71 Kbps, as measured by www.dslreports.com/stest on a backbone connection to San Francisco.

Yesterday, it ran as high as 280 Kbps, but fell as low as 66 Kbps. Keep in mind that an old-fashioned dial-up phone modem

connection is rated at 56 Kbps. I'm finding that the 1,000 baht-per-month ADSL lines on offer are doing better than they did a year ago, but they're still extremely slow by international standards. Speeds fall off drastically in the afternoons, especially on weekends.

Why? They're oversubscribed. TOT and TT&T have sold too many 1 Mbps lines without installing the data pipes necessary to keep up with growing demand.

I wish I could say that the premium subscription lines – the ones offered by companies other than TOT and TT&T – work better, but I haven't seen any evidence to that effect; what I hear anecdotally leaves me doubtful. I've repeatedly challenged those other companies to prove me wrong, but I haven't yet had one taker.

Here's why I'm so enthralled with CAT's ADSL line. Two days ago CAT installed a new ADSL line in my home office, in northern Patong. I can now compare TT&T ADSL and CAT ADSL side-by-side. Right now, with my TT&T ADSL line delivering 71 Kbps, my CAT ADSL line running the same test program on the same computer is humming along at 1,442 Kbps – 20 times faster than TT&T.

For a change, I'm a happy camper.

SIPA, PSU to hold .Net 'boot camp'

The Prince of Songkla University (PSU), Phuket campus, and the Phuket branch of the Software Industry Promotion Agency (SIPA) will hold the "Southern Microsoft Certified Professional Developer (MCPD): Web Developer Boot Camp" from April 23 to May 16.

The goal of the boot camp is to increase the number of local software developers and to improve their skills by training them in Microsoft .NET Framework to an international standard.

The .NET Framework, as described by Microsoft, "is a development and execution environment that allows different programming languages & libraries to work together seamlessly to create Windows-based applica-

tions that are easier to build, manage, deploy, and integrate with other networked systems."

To be accepted for the course, applicants must be software developers and graduates in related studies in one of the 14 southern provinces. A basic knowledge of program writing and .Net is required, and registrants must take the Microsoft Basic Web Developer exam as entry exam, from which organizers will choose the 55 boot camp participants.

The entrance exam will be on April 7 with the results announced April 14.

Registrants must each place a deposit, 2,000 baht for new graduates or 10,000 baht for professional software developers, which will be refunded after the course. The number of lectures has yet to be set, but the organizers have ruled that a participant must attend at least 80% of the lectures to get a refund.

SIPA lecturer Akesak Omromthurapoj, a Microsoft Certified Trainer, Microsoft Certified Application Developer and Microsoft Certified Database Administrator, will conduct the lectures.

Classes will be at the PSU Phuket campus between 9 am and 10 pm. Nantikorn Thaijaroen of the PSU Faculty of Technology and Environment explained, "Participants must attend classes at PSU each day of the course; there are no days off."

Each registrant who passes the course will be issued a certificate. The deadline for registration is April 5.

ne question everyone seems to be asking is: What is happening to the Thai baht? In US dollar terms, it has been fluctuating at rates from 32 to 35 on an almost daily basis.

The reason for this is intervention by the Bank of Thailand (BoT), the country's central bank. The scenario originated on December 19 last year, when the BoT imposed controversial capital controls in an effort to stem the rise of the currency. Authorities were concerned that a stronger baht would make Thai exports less competitive on world markets. They were also convinced that foreign money was flooding into Thailand at an unsustainable rate.

When the capital controls were issued, Pridiyathorn Devakula, Finance Minister at the time, issued a statement to the effect that the new policy was the best ever devised by the BoT. Markets thought otherwise, the immediate nosedive in the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index reflecting just how badly matters had been "thought out".

Following a subsequent series of piecemeal policy changes, the latest development is that the 30% withholding requirement on foreign funds has now been effectively withdrawn – if foreign money entering Thai financial markets is already "fully hedged" into foreign currencybond.

The Economist magazine referred to Thailand's capital controls as "bungled" and changes to foreign business ownership laws as "muddle-headed". These are accurate assessments.

The cost to Thailand has been significant. *The Nation* on February 14, 2007, cited the Finance Ministry as saying that the Bank of Thailand, through its constant intervention in currency markets, had caused 1.4 trillion baht (about US\$40 billion) to be added to Thailand's bond market – its public debt.

When central banks inter-

vene to stop their currency from rising in value, they are using local funds to buy foreign currency. To finance this activity the central bank has two choices: "sanitized" or "unsanitized" intervention. In the former case, bonds – which are simply debt instruments – reflect the amount of intervention; in the latter case, the central bank simply prints more money to cover the expense.

The BoT's interventions in the currency markets have resulted in the baht trading at slightly over 35 baht to the US dollar. In trading after hours, the baht then rapidly moves back up to around 32 or 33 to the dollar.

It is easy to imagine BoT staff jumping into their cars at the end of the working day, and by the time they reach home the currency has already appreciated.

Bloomberg analysts ob-

served that this appreciation is not caused by speculators, but by normal foreign exchange purchases of the baht "after hours". Very little offshore liquidity exists and, naturally, in a situation of this sort it takes only small amounts of buying to force the currency upward.

Thailand is running a small current account surplus which, basically, means that Thailand is living within its means and the surplus is causing the currency to appreciate. There was evidence that some foreign funds were interested in the latter part of 2006 in investing mainly in the Thai bond market.

Some of this money undoubtedly came from the "yen carry trade". This is where money is borrowed in yen, which has very low interest rates, and invested in higher-yielding bond markets around the world.

Only a very small part of this ever arrived in Thailand because, quite frankly, Thailand was not that attractive as an investment destination.

In December 2006, 10-year Thai government bonds yielded about 5.2%, well below yields in other markets, such

as Australia and New Zealand.

Much of the pressure to stem the rise of the Thai baht came from the export sector, which wanted to to keep its product prices competitive.

In a hard-hitting statement, BoT Audit Committee Chairman Nontaphon Nimsomboon was quoted in the March 14 *Nation* as saying, "The central bank cannot help exporters endlessly, like we donate blankets [to the poor] every year. [Exporters] should learn to stand on their own two feet."

The central bank's withholding measure on capital inflows was intended to put a brake on the rapid rise and give exporters a breather. It was not designed to completely stop the baht from "going north" – appreciating in value.

What could the BoT have done to ease the pressure on the baht? The answer is actually very simple: reduce interest rates. In December 2006, its lending rates were 5%. The bank has since had two interest rate reductions, of 0.25 percentage points in each case, making the current rate 4.5%.

There is much speculation that there will be a further reduction of 0.5 of a point at the next meeting, scheduled for April 11. It is a great pity that the BoT did not just simply reduce interest rates by a full 1% back in December. It would have sent a strong message to any "yen carry trade" investors.

The BoT now states that upward pressure on the baht is simply being caused by exporters buying the local currency with proceeds earned in US dollars.

There comes a time in every successful nation's history when the local currency starts to appreciate in value or domestic costs rise, making export products more expensive in the global market

This signals a challenge to exporters, who need to "move upstream" by boosting productivity and quality. It is never a pleasant adjustment, but it is a challenge that many other countries have been able to meet.

Readers are probably wondering how to take advantage of the situation through buying the baht low and selling high.

Unfortunately, the banks are the ones reaping these profits. Unless you start your own bank, there's really no way to get into this.

In reality, many institutional foreign investors view Thailand as having a rather unattractive outlook.

The "savior" of the Thai currency may come from an unwelcome source; oil prices appear likely to rise in coming months and this will result in much higher import costs.

Anantara Resort to open in Phuket

PHUKET: Through its Anantara Resorts brand, Minor International Corporation is investing in a major new resort on Phuket to be located next to the JW Marriott on Mai Khao Beach.

The resort is scheduled to open late next year with 82 one-bedroom Pool Villas and one two-bedroom Pool Villa to be designated as a Presidential Suite.

The Phuket property will be one of 10 new Anantara Resorts to be built in Asia in the next two years. 

Yada, Yada...The Art of Nothingness

nyone who knows anything about boxing in Asia – more specifically boxing in Thailand – knows one of the biggest problems in the sport is the blatant mismatches. Call it one of my pet peeves, but I don't particularly like to know the result of a fight before it takes place.

Excitement in boxing stems from the not knowing. When a fight is legally fixed, so to speak, forget about the edge-of-the-seat moments a good seesaw battle can provide and forget about a visiting fighter getting the win.

In Thailand, far too many Thai fighters are matched with fighters who don't belong in a boxing ring, much less in a ring with a fighter who has 50 or 60 professional fights PLUS 100 or more professional Muay Thai fights. So my response was simple and to the point, "Make good fights...yada, yada, yada,"

Yada, yada, yada = Don't throw hapless Filipino or Mexican taxi drivers in with former or current champions to make the Thai fighter look good in the eyes of the viewers.

The average boxing fan really wants only one thing – to be

entertained. It generally makes no difference if a boxer is a world champion or making his pro debut, if a fight is compelling, the fans are happy. How compelling can a fight be if the result is already a forgone conclusion?

So when promoting fights, those using solid fighters will in all likelihood get solid results. Don't bring a taxi driver to fight against a champion boxer and don't send a fighter to perform brain surgery.

The problem, I was told, is "the good fighters don't want to come to Thailand for the money we are able to offer."

So? Offer more money! If the money isn't there, then match Thai fighters against one another. How often does this happen? Not often enough; in fact fights between Thais in boxing are rare, especially fights between the country's top-ranked fighters.

The pool of boxers in Thailand is indeed deep so why not use the resources right in front of you? Why import third-rate fighters to put on lousy shows when there's a plethora of good fighters right on your doorstep?

About a year ago, former WBA Super Bantamweight Champion Somsak Sitchatchawal squared off in a tune-up bout

against a fighter by the name of Almaz Assanov. At the time of the fight, Somsak was 42-1-1 and Assanov had one fight – a loss.

To make matters worse, Assanov was fighting for the WBO Asia Pacific Bantamweight title.

Not that the WBO Asia Pacific Title is what I'd call a true title but whatever happened to earning a title shot?

I openly challenged the legitimacy of the fight, and the promoter, shocked to hear of my desire to see two evenly-matched fighters in the ring, told me I didn't know what I was talking about and then stormed off.

The boxing cards in Thailand are 99% free to the spectators. Muay Thai fans, however, pay between 200 and 1,600 baht for tickets. These fans come to

Bangkok stadiums six days a week, every week of the year, to watch muay Thai and, most importantly, to gamble. The majority of fights are Thai vs Thai and the stadiums are standing room only, every day. If Thai fans are willing to pay to watch muay Thai, you'd think they'd be willing to pay to see world-class boxers.

Muay Thai has a huge following in the country, second only to soccer. On any given day you can walk by a shophouse or restaurant and inevitably you'll find a TV showing muay Thai. A few years ago the Thai government instituted a broadcast regulation that prohibits stations from televising more than two hours of muay Thai per broadcast. Thus the stations are hesitant to show boxing on a muay Thai card, fearful they'll lose viewers who don't

care for boxing. For now at least, muay Thai is the cash cow.

Boxing managers are in the business of getting fighters the best purse for the least amount of risk, but there's a fine line between finding an opponent who gives your fighter work and an opponent who is merely there to take a beating.

So there are some difficulties that need to be overcome... yada, yada, yada...what's new?

Good fights and good fighters = happy fans and a healthier boxing scene. It's not rocket science – its boxing!

ubbish is something we all produce everyday. Before anyone says it, yes, I know that I produce rubbish too. Once a week, somewhere near the back of the Phuket Gazette. But what can we do to redress the balance a bit? Recycle? I'm not sure, to be honest.

Recycling is taught to children today as if it were a religious doctrine; unbelievers who don't recycle will go straight to hell.

I wonder whether recycling is just a bit of a Western scam to make consumers feel less guilty about consumption. "I know consumption is bad for the planet," they may well think, "but I can still buy heaps of stuff, because I recycle."

Many local and national governments in the West encourage their eager citizens to separate diligently. Consequently, many homes have boxes of carefully separated rubbish – a bin for paper, one for glass and another for plastic. Huge trucks then come along regularly to collect the contents of these boxes.

Where does that truck's oil and diesel come from? Where does the energy come from to break down that paper? Where does the water appear from that mulches that paper? What about the bleach used on the old paper to make new paper, or the fuel that heats the glass up enough to

Even if it did make sense, everything is so expensive over there that there's no way it could be economically viable. I wonder how much of this stuff that disappears into the recycle truck's bowels actually makes it to where

we think it's going? Will we ever know?

At least there's one place where recycling in its truest form exists very successfully - Thailand. These old ladies with ancient sidecar motorcycles that draw up outside your Phuket home every day and rummage through the rubbish.

They all have their own specialties, it seems. The plastic bottle ladies pick out the plastic stuff, leaving the cardboard, paper and glass bottles to their respective collectors who will inevitably appear later. Even Phuket bin men are in on the act - as they empty your bin, they do the separating for you, and make sure everything ends up in exactly the right place.

There's no scam or government-backed feel-good factor here – you know full well that this stuff really will be used again or recycled. And even better, these bin men and sidecar ladies are making a few baht from it. Now that's recycling at its finest.

Recycling in the West probably wastes more than it saves. Instead of recycling, why not reuse and refuse – and not only plastic bags from the supermarket, but everything. Bread wrappers are sandwich bags. Tin cans are pencil holders. Refusing is not

using in the first place. Don't buy a newspaper with the idea of recycling. Read someone else's. Then leave it where yet another person can find and read it. Bring your own plastic bags to the supermarket. And so on. Bert the environmentalist? I'll be hugging trees next.

Conservation organizations themselves are equally guilty of producing rubbish. They try to give the impression that by sending out their junk mail, which you never asked for in the first place, on recycled paper they are helping the natural environment.

The best way for them to help the natural environment would be for them not to send out unsolicited junk mail in the first place. That really would be con-

in your garden, too. Once you've collected all your bits of coconut husk, stray leaves, grass clippings and plant trimmings, rather than stuffing them into plastic bags and leaving them outside to be taken away, why not put them to use in your garden?

Coconut husks are like surrogate plant pots – they're brilliant. Instead of going to Homepro and buying half a dozen of those cheap, nasty little orange plant pots, drill a hole in the bottom of a few coconut husks and you have plant pots that haven't cost you a penny and are environmentally sound.

Even the plants that grow in them are likely to be happier, as the roots will meet something natural as they grow out, rather than an impenetrable plastic wall. You can reuse and recycle Bromeliads such as orchids are

very much at home on a chunk of coconut husk - all they need is something to grab hold of.

Most garden rubbish can be recycled on site as mulch or compost. "Recycling" is probably a bit of a misnomer, as it implies that you actually have to do something. Far from it.

Leaves can be used on their own as a mulch, but they're somewhat unwilling to stay in place in windy locations and they easily wash away from beds during heavy rain showers. Leaves perform best as a mulching material when they are shredded or

Grass clippings are the least ideal mulching material. They are easily blown away by the wind, decompose very rapidly, and can pack down to form a mat that could exclude air and water from the root zone. Therefore, spread grass thinly over the ground, mixed with other mulching materials or even better, composted with other yard waste so it sticks together more effectively.

In an ideal world, trimmings such as twigs and small branches should be shredded before they are used as a mulch. A mechanical chipper/shredder is needed for this process. As most of us don't have one of these devices on standby, you'll probably have to either dump or burn your clipped branches and twigs.

So what to do with this mulch stuff? You can use it around plants in beds or around individual trees and shrubs in a lawn. Eliminating grass from around plants greatly reduces the competition for water and nutrients from the turf and increases the growth rate and health of trees and shrubs.

In addition to being useful around plants, you can use mulch as ground cover for walks, trails, driveways, and play and natural areas. It can also be composted and used as a soil amendment for flower and vegetable gardens.

The amount of mulch to apply will depend on the texture and density of the mulch. Compost and many wood and bark mulches are composed of fine particles and shouldn't be any deeper than about 10 centimeters after settling. Excessive amounts of these fine-textured mulches around shallow-rooted plants can suffocate their roots causing disease and poor growth. Mulches composed solely of leaves or grass clippings should never be more than about five centimeters

Recycle because it saves a few baht or because you want to. Or don't recycle at all, and leave it to the experts - those sidecar ladies will be here before you know it. I'm only too happy to donate a few small green bottles to them; and that means it's time for another Heineken.

WHERE EAST MEETS WEST

ecorating a room with different styles of furniture can be a challenge, especially when the designs hail from different parts of the world – such as Asia and Europe.



Construction Update

Kamala Falls under way

ite clearance for the Kamala Falls project by developer Lotus Trinity has begun on 18 rai of Kamala hillside, and construction is expected to begin by the end of April.

Ben Daniel, Managing Director of Lotus Trinity Co, explained that the project will comprise 12 condominium blocks and six villas. Construction will be divided into two phases, and will start with the residential buildings on the top level and proceed down the hill to the clubhouse.

The project is expected to be completed by the end of 2008.

Mr Daniel explained that the name Kamala Falls was inspired by a small stream that flows down the hill and passes through the development. The main sales focus of Kamala Falls will be its geography and location

"Kamala has the community spirit of a village. There are many restaurants and bars here but if you want an even more active lifestyle, Patong is only five kilometers from Kamala Falls," he said.

The development will be built on different levels facing the sea. There is forest land around the development and the nearest beach is 300 meters away.

There will be 102 units of contemporary-style apartments in 12 buildings with a four-bedroom penthouse atop each. Penthouses will each have an area of 650 to 689 square meters, each with a private pool measuring 9m by 3m, or 15m by 3m. Prices for the penthouses will start at 26 million baht.

There will be 66 two-bedroom "superior" apartments, ranging from 177sqm to 195sqm, which can be converted into three-bedroom units. Prices will start at 9 million baht.

An option for customers that Mr Daniel expects to be in strong demand is the one-bedroom "deluxe" apartments. Each of these 24 apartments will have an area of 82sqm to 97sqm. Prices for these units will begin at 5.5 mil-

lion baht apiece.

"Our condominium buildings will be four-story buildings built in steps against the hillside, and we will have glass elevators providing views over the trees. Each block will have a 30m-by-8.5m swimming pool, and the pools will be connected by a series of cascading waterfall features. We will have a lot of greenery and water here," Mr Daniel said.

There will be six four-bedroom pool villas, each with an area of 717sqm, on the top level of the development. Two floor plans will be offered: bedroom pool view or living room pool view. Villa prices will start at 50 million baht each.

"We will build the villas when the client has agreed on the architectural specifications because we have created some basic plans and if they want to change them, they are welcome to do that," said Mr Daniel.

"Facilities in the development will include a mini-mart, spa, travel agent and a sales and rental office. The main focus is on entertainment, so there will be a large bar and restaurant. There are very few first-class seaview restaurants on the west cost between Laguna and Patong, so we felt that it was important to have one here. Another large pool will featured at the clubhouse," he

The primary marketing concepts for Lotus Trinity are the geography of the area, the living space and the rental value, said Mr Daniel.

'Our main idea is blending the inside and outside living areas. We really want to make the terrace usable, our smallest terrace for a one-bedroom unit will be 15sqm and all the doors will open fully to give you more space.

"All the materials are

matched inside and outside so it will look like one big floor.

"We believe that the rental market will be very strong and the apartments will be the first to sell – and to facilitate those investors we have a 'Rental Ready' furniture package," he said.

Kamala Falls is aimed at investors from Hong Kong, Singapore and Scandinavia, Mr Daniel said. "We have a dedicated Scandinavian sales team and we are working closely with them. We will be joining exhibitions in Dubai, Dublin and London at the end of summer.


"This will be a much more aggressive marketing campaign than we have done before. Previously, we were involved with projects in Bang Tao and the problem there is the activities and facilities are really only in Laguna.

"But here we have everything and Patong is very close, so for people who want to be near activities but not right in the middle of it with all the noisy music and tourists running around, this is the perfect balance," he said.






