Private funding to build expo center?

NAI YANG: Phuket's decadesold dream of having an International Convention and Exhibition Center (ICEC) took a step forward on May 28, when Ministry of Tourism and Sports (MoTS) Minister Suwit Yodmanee ordered the formation of a provincial panel and gave it 60 days to decide where the center should be sited.

Revived interest in ICEC investment featured a May 25 meeting by ING Funds (Thailand) Co Ltd Managing Director Maris Tarab with Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit and Suwalai Pinpradab, Director of Tourism Authority of Thailand's Southern Region 4 office in Phuket, at the Governor's Office at Phuket Provincial Hall.

Mr Maris proposed that ING Funds build a 10,000-seat conference and exhibition center on some 2,000 rai under the control of the Treasury Department's State Property Management and Services Office, or Ratchapassadu, in Mai Khao.

Mr Maris' plan for ING to completely fund the center's construction on a 30-year "build-operate-transfer" agreement with the government was well-received by Gov Niran.

During a meeting with Prime Minister Surayud Chulanont in Krabi last month, Gov Niran was told to find private sector funding for the convention center, as the interim government had no intention of granting funding approval.

Under the ING proposal, the firm would rent the Ratchapassadu land from the Treasury Department under a 30-year lease, during which time it would

build and manage the center using subcontracted management firms, both Thai and foreign, Mr Maris told Gov Niran.

Mr Maris said the plan would require no government funding.

"Project construction could be started within one year...All we need from the government is a land lease agreement," he said.

The terms of the management offer was similar to one ING recently signed to build dormitories for Thammasat University in Bangkok, he said.

Also attending the meeting was Montree Buritan, Managing Director of building firm EkCa Thai Co Ltd, which will design and build the center if the ING proposal is approved.

EkCA Thai already has a

prototype model drawn up for a meetings, incentives, conventions and exhibitions (MICE) center with seating for 10,000.

The model, based on an existing convention center in Chiang Mai, could be easily modified to be used at the site in Mai Khao. Construction could begin two months after approval, he said.

In addition to offering easy access by air, sea and road, the Mai Khao site is also an attractive seaside location appropriate for Phuket, he added.

Gov Niran also agreed that the Mai Khao site was appropriate, as it would be located near a sports complex, also to be built on Ratchapassadu land, which has attracted 70 million baht

Police have no strong leads in murder of money lender

TUNG TONG: Police admit they have no strong leads in their investigation into the brutal murder of a businessman who was found stabbed to death in his Bangtong Village home on May 22.

Tung Tong Police Investigating Inspector Lt Col Passakorn Sontikul told the *Gazette* the bloody corpse of 62-year-old Kajorn "Ko Jorn" Somnam was discovered by his live-in partner Wassana Chookaew, 51, at about 7 pm, when she returned from a visit to relatives in another province.

She immediately notified police, who arrived at the scene at about 8:30 pm with forensic experts, Col Passakorn said.

The apparent cause of death was two stab wounds, one to the neck and one to the body.

Inside the home, numerous land title deeds and registration books for both cars and motorcycles were found scattered.

The victim ran a moneylending operation from his home in which such documents were used as collateral to obtain personal loans, Col Passakorn said.

Among the evidence collected at the site were at least two separate sets of bloody footprints and fingerprints.

The murder weapon was not found, but evidence collected from the bedroom included a brassiere and a used sanitary napkin. K. Wassana told police the items did not belong to her.

Col Passakorn told the *Gazette* that police are investigating romatic jealousy or a dispute arising from K. Kajorn's business dealings as possible motives, but as yet have no strong leads. They are seeking the owner of the bra and sanitary napkin.





Navy rescues 'VIP' from 'terrorists'

CAPE PANWA: A "VIP" was rescued by officers from the Royal Thai Navy Third Naval Command May 24 as part of an anti-terrorism drill held off Cape Panwa.

About 50 officers from the Navy, Marine Police and Marine Transport Office took part in the drill, which simulated the rescue of a Thai government VIP from a terrorist boat in the sea off Cape Panwa. According to the story line, the VIP had been seized by terrorists from a resort on Mai Ton Island.

As the "terrorists" were making their demands, a Navy SEAL team stormed the terrorists' boat, freeing the hostage.

Rear Admiral Supot Pruksa, Commanding Officer of the Third Naval Area Command, told the *Gazette*, "We are ready to deal with hostage situations and will always put the safety of the hostage first. Phuket is a world-famous destination, and if VIP guests are threatened, we must be ready to help them.

"We keep a constant watch for terrorism and now there is no cause to be worried. We have many boats patrolling and informing us of any news," he said

Call for more police volunteers

PHUKET: Phuket Provincial Police Commander Maj Gen Decha Budnampetch once again called for more police officers and civil defense volunteers in a meeting of the Phuket Provincial Security Committe on the morning of May 29 at the ST Hotel.

Comparing Phuket with Las Vegas, Phuket's top cop said that more officers are needed to keep Phuket safe, especially after seven coordinated bombs rocked popular tourist spots in Haad Yai, Songkhla on the night of May 27.

At the meeting, chairman Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima expressed concerns for the security of Phuket following the most recent wave of bombings to hit that southern city.

"For the time being, I would like to ask police officers at Tah Chat Chai checkpoint to continue checking for bombs, guns and suspicious people 24 hours a day," he said.

Gen Decha replied that all of the 1,060 officers in Phuket are working hard, but there are still not enough officers.

in funding, much of it from first need to be held to discuss a abroad. wide variety of related issues.

"This idea is brilliant. I have long been interested in finding private funds for a convention center, but usually we end up needing about a billion baht in state funding, and we have had trouble reaching any solid conclusions about where it should be located," said Gov Niran.

"This is the easiest way, especially as using Ratchapassadu land means we won't need to comply with the laws applying to private sector developments on state land, nor seek Cabinet approval."

Phuket's tourism industry has suffered for too long from its inability to host large MICE events, he said.

The convention center and sports complex could attract further investment to Mai Khao, where an investment boom in medical services, spas and yachting could lead to the develop of a "new city" in line with provincial development plans, he said.

However, meetings would first need to be held to discuss a wide variety of related issues, such as laws on foreign investment and environmental impact, he added

On May 28, after Gov Niran had left on a trip to Finland, Dr Suwit chaired a large meeting on the ICEC issue at the Indigo Pearl Hotel in Nai Yang. Attending the gathering were TAT Governor Pornsiri Manoharn, Phuket Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima, and representatives from numerous state agencies and private sector groups, including the Thailand Convention and Exhibition Bureau (TCEB), The Board of Investment of Thailand (BOI), Phuket Tourist Association (PTA), Phuket Chamber of Commerce, Phuket Treasury Office and representatives of ING Funds.

After lengthy discussions, it was agreed only that the project should go ahead with private sector funding, with the government agreeing not to undermine such

investment by funding a rival convention center in the province at some time in the future.

Following objections that the Mai Khao site is too far from the island's main population centers, the intractable problem of where to site the center once again reared its head.

Wichit Na-Ranong, who sits on the Thailand Tourism Council advisory board and is also the Managing Director of the Pearl Group of hotels, said that the presence of hotel accommodation, public services and transport links all needed to be taken into consideration when making the siting decision.

The two sites now under consideration in Mai Khao, including the one being eyed by ING Funds, may be lacking in this regard, he said.

Phuket Real Estate Club President and former Phuket City Mayor Phummisak Hongsyok was among those who said that local investors should be allowed to submit proposals for the project, rather than automatically cede it to foreign investment.

K. Wichit and K. Phummisak lead two of Phuket's largest families of landowners.

When the discussions were concluded, Dr Suwit asked the Governor's Office to appoint a committee, to be chaired by the governor himself, to be responsible for reaching a final agreement on the siting issue. The panel should consult with the TCEB and forward its final decision to him within 60 days, he said.

In the interim, private sector parties will be allowed to submit construction and management plans using either of two sites on Ratchapassadu land in Mai Khao or land held by the private parties themselves, it was agreed.

BOI officials would review the ING Funds proposal during that period, he said.

"This committee will choose the best location, considering such factors as proximity to the city center and the airport...I don't think it should be too hard for them to make a decision with the input of so many people attending today, most of whom are local businessmen familiar with the issues involved and the local geography. We also need their input on how the center should be managed and what role the government should play."

TAT studies have determine the minimum land area for the project is 125 rai, he said.

Noting that the current TAT proposal for the project has been pending for about four years, Dr Suwit said he was determined to reach a decision within the term of the interim government that appointed him.

Dr Suwit confirmed that the interim government would not invest in the convention center project, nor would it fund a competing venue later on.

"The government doesn't have a lot of money to fund such projects and its priorities lie elsewhere ... We will support the development of only one convention and exhibition center through the various government agencies directly involved. We want Phuket to be as competitive as possible in the MICE market and we are open to foreign investment in order to achieve this," he said.

The arrest came in a sting operation by Phuket City Police and the Pavena Foundation, which the girl had contacted for wrongdoing.

According to a Phuket City Police press release, a Swiss man named "Mark", a Phuket resident who works in the property industry, responded to a post placed on an unnamed chat site by 18-yearold Warn (not her real name) which read: "I have no money to pay school fees, I need help".

K. Warn said that Mark promised to give her money if she would come and live with him in Phuket, do housework and have sex with him on request. K. Warn then stopped contacting him, she told police.

After a while the two started chatting again and eventually exchanged phone numbers, K. Warn said. Mark then sent K. Warn an SMS reading "I want u be my gf", K. Warn said. She ignored it.

K. Warn said she then began to chat with another man, called Josef. His writing style was very similar to Mark's, but she thought nothing of it at the time, she told police.

Josef said that he did not have enough money to help her himself but would introduce her to a friend, Ranier, who would be prepared to help her with her 60,000 baht of overdue university fees if she would "look after" him well when he came on holiday to Thailand.

K. Warn said that she assumed Josef meant that she should show Ranier the sights and take him out to dinner.

Josef, K. Warn explained to police, asked for her to send him photos of herself in various poses using her fingers or "other implements" or wearing high heels. These Josef would pass on to Ranier, she was told.

Ranier himself then emailed to tell her that if the pictures did not please him, he would not agree to help her, K. Warn said. Ranier also asked for details about her university, purportedly to find out whether she really was behind on paying her fees, she said.

K. Warn explained to police that at this point she asked Ranier to call her on her mobile phone.

When he called, however, the name Mark appeared on her phone's screen. It was the same number he had called her from before, she said.

After talking for some time, K. Warn got Mark to admit that Josef and Ranier did not exist and that all three men were none other than Mark, she told police.

K. Warn became angry with Mark's duplicity, but he responded by threatening that if she did not do exactly as he instructed her, he would post obscene photos of her with her contact details on many websites - including that of her university, K. Warn claimed.

To back up the threat and prove that he was serious, he sent her a sample file showing her in an explicit pose together with her contact information, she said.

On May 24, Mark transferred 4,000 baht into her account for her to fly and meet him in Phuket, K. Warn claimed.

She then decided to contact Pavena Hongsakul, founder of the Pavena Foundation.

The foundation contacted Col Nos Sawetalek, Superintendent of Phuket City Police Station, and laid a plan to snare Mark at the airport when he went to collect K. Warn.

On May 26 K. Warn, accompanied by Pavena Foundation staff, arrived at the airport. When Mark came to greet her, he was arrested.

Police searched Mark's Patong home, where they seized a computer and a webcam as evidence in the case.

Capt Patrawut Onchuang, a Deputy Inspector at Phuket City Police Station, told the Gazette that Mark has denied any wrongdoing.

At last report, he was being held at Tah Chat Chai Police Station and had yet to be charged with any offense.

Villagers back marina plan

PHUKET CITY: In the latest in a back-and-forth dispute between opposing village groups, developers and the government, about 200 villagers from Baan Yamu in Pa Khlok May 29 staged a peaceful demonstration outside the Phuket Provincial Hall to show their support for a controversial marina project at Cape

The planned 60-million-baht project, to be constructed by The Yamu Co, would also include a 39-berth marina, a hotel covering 100 rai and other facilities.

The group had a letter addressed to Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit showing their support for the project.

The marina would end the villagers reliance on subsistence fishing, move them into more modern vocations and provide ren's futures, the letter said.

The group, led by Bangsod Densiri, arrived in two buses at

By 10:15 am, Piya Bharatasilpin, Chief Administrative Officer (palad) of Phuket Province, came down to accept the letter on behalf of Gov Niran.

'We came here to show our support for the Yamu marina project. Nobody put us up to this. We came by ourselves because we want Yamu to enjoy the benefits of development, just as parts of the island have," K. Bangsod

"Phuket is a tourist destination...but the development is happening very slowly at Baan Yamu.

"We want the project to give villagers more jobs, more money and a better life," he said.

Pariyes Rattanadilok Na Phuket, General Manager of The Yamu Company, was also at the







ross the Sarasin Bridge into Phang Nga province and head north toward Khok Kloy and Tai Muang, and you will pass through quiet villages and countryside reflective of Phuket perhaps 20 years ago. Peaceful.

But under the surface there is the steady buzz of development in the air – though you'll have to get off the main road and over to the beaches to see and feel the boom.

Starting at Pilai Beach and moving north to Natai, Bor Daan and Tah Sai beaches – and on up to Tai Muang – billions of baht are being spent on up-scale residential estates, five-star resorts and assorted combinations of both.

Developers and government officials agree that the boom is based on the beauty of the area, its easy access to Phuket International Airport and the fact that there are few large tracts of land suitable for resort development remaining on Phuket.

Pilai and Natai seem headed toward residential and small resort development, while Bo Daan and Tah Sai are slated for large-scale resorts and estates.

Bill Barnett, Managing Director of C9 Hotelworks told the *Gazette* that "Pilai and Natai don't have large land tracts, it is a residential area, but the Tah Sai area is poised to be a major hotel market because there are large land tracts available. Land with direct access to the beach – the next Laguna – where developers are buying 100 rai at a time.

"You can't find that kind of land anymore on Phuket. You'd be hard-pressed to see two or three good five-star resort locations left on Phuket," he added.

Phang Nga Tourism Association President Chittiporn Suthipibul said that the development from Pilai Beach through to Tai Muang had started before the 2004 tsunami. The first project was the Hotspring Beach Resort and Spa in 2002, and then anoth-

LOOK OUT PHUKET Phang Nga is coming up

The drive between Sarasin Bridge and Tai Muang in Phang Nga province has long been a view of quiet rural Thailand not often seen in recent times in Phuket. But that's now changing. These days the Phang Nga coastline is humming with activity. International and Thai investors have snapped up the seafront and are heading full bore into developing the area into a continuous stretch of upscale residential and resort luxury. er three or four five-star projects started development. Those projects halted after the tsunami but started to take off again last year.

"For this year, I know that there are many new projects from both Thai and foreign investors, some of them were planned before the tsunami and stopped after it hit. Now they are starting up again.

"I know that soon a megaproject of about 3 billion baht will happen in the Tai Muang area. I think it's good news because investors are confident about the potential of this area," she said, adding that she couldn't yet divulge the details of the megaproject.

"We have investors coming to do good and qualified projects here. They understand the provincial policy and the tourism format here very well, we are working to protect the environment and beaches.

"Phang Nga's tourism policy is to have sustainable tourism.

If we can conserve the environment, our tourism will continue longer. This is the focus for Phang Nga, because if investors are not concerned about the environment, they will benefit only in the short term and tourists will change their destination," she


"The main attractions for the Khok Kloy area [where Pilai and Natai beaches are located] are the beauty of the beaches and that the location is close to the Phuket airport," she added.

K. Chittiporn said her only concerns are the development of good services and infrastructure for the area.

"Waste and water treatment systems are the responsibility of each developer, but for infrastructure such as public roads, electricity and water supply I would like the local administrations to work with the private sector. I think it will be good if they start now and if it works well, it will be a pilot plan for the growth that will come later," she said

Sutha Madmalai, Chief of Public Works of the Natoey Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*), which includes the Bo Daan and Tah Sai area, told the *Gazette* that the main reason that the property business started to boom there was because the Natai beachfront in Khok Kloy was full. This pushed the development north to Bo Daan and Tah

Sai beaches, which are a total of about 15 kilometers long.

The Natoey area has nine small villages with a population of about 8,400 people. It's bordered on the north by Tai Muang and the south by Khok Kloy.

"The Raffles Resort and Residences will be the biggest project in Natoey area with 162 rai of land and if there are no problems, they might start construction by the end of this year."

He added that another project has already cleared their land and put up a fence, but has not yet asked permission to begin construction. The project, to be called "Malibuland", includes plans to build a lagoon resort of 100 rai with about 40 to 80 villas in the Tah Sai Beach area.

'We will have no problem with water supply because we have many lagoons and tin mines to accumulate water," K. Sutha

"The local people have no issues with the developments because there will be good jobs on offer and most beachfront land already belonged to investors; local people were not living in the beachfront area," he added.

Montha Aiyarak, the Headman of Natai village told the Gazette that the development at Natai Beach started four or five years ago but the rapid growth began after the tsunami. The development has not disturbed the 120 families of about 640 villagers in Natai area, he said.

"Most villagers work on rubber plantations or are employees of companies or resorts. We have both Buddhists and Muslims living together in roughly equal numbers. The growth of many developments here hasn't disturbed our lifestyle. It will help

some of our villagers by providing jobs in hotels and resorts," he

According to Suwit Koeysakul, President of the Khok Kloy *OrBorTor*, the total population in the Khok Kloy area, which includes Natai, is about 12,000 people. Most people in the area work on rubber plantations or farms, or as fishermen.

"Natai Beach is about 2km long and it used to be a coconut plantation. At that time land cost about 1-2 million baht per rai but right now it has increased to 15-20 million baht per rai.

"Most of the property in the area is private houses or villas, more so than hotels or resorts. Many foreigners bought land and built houses here because the beach is so quiet. I believe the investment here is more than 1 billion baht," he said.

He added that a good feature of Natai Beach is its proximity to Phuket International Airport. If you compare driving to Phuket City and Khok Kloy, the drive to Khok Kloy is closer and there are no traffic jams, he said.

K. Suwit also said the biggest problems for Khok Kloy are basic infrastructure and water supply, but the *OrBorTor* already budgeted 3 million baht to improve the water supply and the construction will be completed in the next three months.

"To help tourism, we are also building a 20 million baht pier that will be 284 meters long. We expect to finish it by the beginning of August. After it is finished people who travel by yacht can visit this area more easily and it will be convenient if they want to go to islands in the bay or out to the Similan Islands," he said.

"I understand that the Sasin Institute of Chulalongkorn University will start construction of a new campus next year on more than 100 rai, and that their complex will include a hotel," he added.


At the Baan Na Klue campus, called the Executive Education Center, Sasin will offer a joint MBA program with Kellogg School of Business beginning in 2008.

Highlighting the move toward upscale properties in the area, the Head of Construction Division from OrBorTor Khok Kloy, Suthin Srirat, told the Gazette of a 450-million-baht private house with a helicopter landing pad planned for the area. The property is expected to sit on 70 rai in the Khok Kloy area and K. Suthin says it will be the most expensive house in Thailand.

Thirsty thieves take top cop's beer

KANCHANABURI: A man noted for his integrity, Acting Royal Thai Police Commissioner General Seripisut Temiyavej has spent the best part of his life fighting the twin scourges of crime and corruption.

In an ironic twist of fate, however, Thailand's top cop recently found himself the victim of a horrific crime when thieves broke into his riverside holiday home in Kanchanaburi and stole his beer.

Inspecting the home after the May 24 break-in, workers found that the general's valuables had been left untouched. It appeared that all the thieves made off with was 10 cans of beer and a selection of snacks with which to enjoy them. The report did not specify the kind or quantity of the missing snacks.

Lamkhuan Srichaisak, a domestic helper in charge of looking after the house while Gen Seripisut is not in residence, said that she went to bed in her quarters, about 70 meters from the main house, at 10 pm the night of the robbery.

When she got up the following morning, the woman found that a back window had been smashed – and 10 cans of beer were missing.

When news of the shocking crime reached Kanchanaburi's finest, Provincial Police Commander Maj Gen Sombun Huapbangyang was soon on the scene – accompanied by a phalanx of other officers and a 20-strong forensic investigation team.

Gen Sombun said that he thought the beer burglar could well have been a former employee and he had called all house staff in for questioning. The thief certainly was not after valuables, Gen Sombun added, as all the valuables were still there.

Col Phutiphat Wongsanguansri, Superintendent of the Royal Thai Police Region 15 Forensics Division, said that he found two of the stolen beer cans discarded in a bush in front of the house. Both had been drained of their contents, he noted.

There was no comment from Gen Seripisut, or Seri as he is known in the Thai press, as to how he felt at the loss of his beer and snacks.

The haste with which Khao Lak businesses shut down for the long low-season break never ceases to amaze me.

As in years past, this year the front runners were restaurants, cafes and dive shops catering to mostly European clientele. So quick are they to put up the shutters that they almost appear anxious to spend another six months with no income.

Some even close their doors by mid-April, when there are still plenty of tourists around.

Despite the downpours and reduced options for dining and entertainment, many Khao Lak holidaymakers do stick around until May, determined not to let bad weather or anything else ruin their vacation.

In the past, Khao Lak had far fewer of these "weather-resistant" tourists, or Touristus Resistensis as I like to call them. Before they would simply move on to sunnier destinations like Samui or Koh Tao on Thailand's gulf coast. Curious about this new phenomenon, I went out to inves-

The answer was simple: many tour operators in Germany and Scandinavia now offer lowpriced low-season specials for the time between May and October to support their affiliated hotels and resorts in the Khao Lak region.

Most of these offers include accommodation and breakfast at some of Khao Lak's most reputable upmarket resorts for just a fraction more of what the air ticket alone would cost.

I was left wondering about the options faced by the ordinary tourist: Is it worth it to pay more to relax on the beach during high season, or is it better to pay far less but risk walking in the rain all day? After all, when the skies do clear and the sun comes out





n enraged loner and gun enthusiast killed three people and injured seven in a twohour clash with police and guards at an open market in Pathum Thani's Klong Luang District.

The rampage began just before dawn when 21-year-old Kiartipong Meksawat was questioned by a security guard as to who was the rightful owner of a motorcycle parked at the entrance of the market.

Kiartipong stabbed and killed the security guard, and the shooting spree began when police arrived to investigate.

The other two men murdered were Pol Sgt Issara Maneesaeng and durian vendor On Thongsuk.

Two hours after the stabbing incident, not far from where the first victim lay dead, Kiartipong was finally shot dead by police.

Initial investigations provided a glimpse into Kiartipong's personality.

It is known that he meditated, visited temples, yet also owned handguns, loved to play violent video games, read gun magazines and had no friends except his sister, who visited him regularly.

Although described as "a loner", police said they were not ruling out the possibility that Kiartipong may have been part of a gang behind a series of motorcycle thefts.

His sister Amnuay said Kiartipong's mother married a foreign man and lived abroad, sending him money regularly.

TB epidemic: Ninety thousand people are infected with tuberculosis in Thailand every year, with about 16.5% of the cases in Bangkok, according to Bangkok Metropolitan Administration Health Department Deputy Director Dr Chanchai Kumphong.

At least 60% of Bangkok infections involve people younger than 45, most of whom live in crowded areas, he said.

National Health Security Office senior official Dr Chuchai Sornchamni said random checks of crowded places like shopping centers, department stores and

markets found one tuberculosis sufferer in every 500 people.

Dr Chanchai said there was a 98% chance of full recovery if treated. "If you cough for two weeks, start losing weight and have a slight fever in the evenings, see a doctor," Dr Chanchai advised.

Worldwide, Thailand has the 17th-highest incidence of tuberculosis, a common and deadly infectious disease caused by mycobacteria infection, most commonly of the lungs.

Deadly discipline: Armed forces Supreme Commander Gener-

al Boonsrang Niumpradit has ordered an inquiry into the death of a 16-year-old student after he was "disciplined" by senior students at the Armed Forces Academies Preparatory School (AFAPS) in Nakhon Nayok.

Preliminary examinations showed that second-year student Karun Orachon died from fluid in his lungs after senior students forced him to drink copious amounts of water. No other physical injury was found.

Pornpipat said the AFAPS established an internal investigation, dismissed a student supervisor and suspended the seven senior students involved. Police are set to question the seven.

The seniors forced Karun to drink 20 liters of water then perform push-ups until he vomited and then made him repeat the tasks.

Karun's father, Pol Lt Colonel Sanchai from Lamphun, made a complaint to Nakhon Nayok police. He has been advised to take action against the students also.

Col Sanchai has received an

apology from the AFAPS, which will arrange his son's funeral.

Frog-tastic find: A species of mountain frog that changes color in response to its surroundings has been discovered in northeast Thailand.

Odorrana aureola, known locally as the Phu Luang Cliff frog, can grow to 80 millimeters and has a green body which occasionally turns brown.

Tanya Chanard, Curator of Bangkok's National Science Museum, studied the frog with a team of government biologists and researchers.

The frog is found only in waterfalls and creeks between 1,000 and 1,500 meters above sea level in Phu Luang National Park, which covers parts of Loei, Phetchabun and Phitsanulok provinces.

The team's findings were confirmed by US-based experts with the natural history journal *Fieldiana* last year.

K. Tanya's team found the frog years ago, but only began studying it at the DNA level last year. It is not known how many

there are in the wild, though the frog is already considered in danger of extinction.

Baht unlikely to rise further: The Bank of Thailand (BOT) has forecast no significant additional pressure on the baht to appreciate, despite a lower surplus or a likely deficit in the balance of

payments next year.

There is no need for the baht to move to the same extent as the Chinese yuan, the central bank said.

Speaking on the Money Channel, BOT Governor Tarisa Watanagase said economic fundamentals indicated there would be no more pressure on the baht to appreciate. Increase in imports from mega-project investments and imports of aircraft would lessen the surplus in the balance of payments or cause a deficit.

"Imports would reduce pressure on the appreciating baht," she said, but added the unit could fluctuate in the short term due to capital movements.

Eyes on pregnant women: Police at Suvarnabhumi Airport arrested a pregnant woman arriving from New Delhi who had swallowed 600 grams of heroin in 50 packets.

Two other pregnant Thai members of a drug-smuggling ring had earlier been arrested by Indian police, Office of the Narcotics Control Board Secretary-General Kitti Limchaikij said.

The identity of the 30-yearold woman has not been revealed. Smugglers use pregnant women because they are exempted from X-ray scans.

K. Kitti said drug-smugglers were using India as an alternative route after 31 pregnant Thai women with packets of heroin in their stomach were arrested in China over the past four months. He did not say what had happened to the women arrested by Chinese authorities, but China has a policy allowing for the execution of drug offenders.

Institute of wisdom: Srina-kharinwirot University (SU) is planning to establish the Thailand's first "Institute of Wisdom", where undergraduates will study His Majesty the King's theories and thoughts.

"This institute will cover His Majesty's sufficiency-economy theory and other knowledge about the environment, community forests, conscience, ethics and moralities," said SU Asst Prof Amnat Yensabai.

The Institute of Wisdom will be established in a patch of degraded forest in Sa Kaew's Watthana Nakhon District, he said.

His Majesty's teachings would be used to restore the forest to its natural state, he added.

The Institute of Wisdom will open next year, with student admissions based on applicant's previous academic performance and work for the public benefit.

Six killed in one day in Yala

people and injured 10 soldiers and police officers in a series of gun and bombs attacks in Yala on May 23. Police managed to track down and kill one of the attackers.

The first attack came at about 6 am in Yaha District, where four members of a family were shot dead in a hut on a rubber plantation.

They were identified Mauseng Jehloh, the 56-year-old father, Nurhayadi Jehloh, his 21-year-old daughter, and nephews Kuseng Tuankohseng and Tuwaeasuming Tuankohseng.

At around 7 am, municipal officer Paijit Thongchua was gunned down in Muang District while riding his motorbike to work.

At about the same time, a group of six Rangers were injured in a bomb attack on Yaha-Patae Rd, also in Yaha District.

Although slightly injured, the officers were able to find and shoot dead the bomber, who was hiding nearby.

Share turns bitter: The leader of an informal co-operative lending scheme known in Thai as "share" was shot dead while driving her motorbike to the mar-

ket in Nakhon Sri Thammarat's Ron Phibun District on May 25.

The body of Sunee Phonsiri, shot once in the chest and once in the head, was found in a roadside ditch next to her Honda Wave motorcycle.

Witnesses told police that shortly after K. Sunee left her

house to go to Khao Chum Thong Market, a car with three men inside pulled up alongside her. One of the assailants shot K. Sunee once, causing her to lose control of her motorbike and and fall into the ditch. The car then pulled over next to her. One man got out and shot K. Sunee again before the

killers sped away in the direction of Chulabhorn District.

Lt Col Cherdchai Mosika, Deputy Superintendent of Ron Phibun District Police Station, said that the victim was a money lender and head of a "share" cooperative lending scheme. A close friend of K. Sunee was also murdered recently. Police believe the two killings are connected.

Pulo calls for contact: The exiled separatist group, the Pattani United Liberation Organization (Pulo), has invited the government to establish direct contact rather than closely monitor its activities in Europe.

"Why don't they meet us directly through the right channels, instead of just monitoring us? The sooner the better," Pulo's foreign affairs committee chief Kasturi Mahkota said May 25.

Council for National Security Chairman Gen Sonthi Boonyaratglin earlier instructed the Foreign Ministry to keep a close watch on the movement of exiled separatists in Europe, particularly those in Sweden.

Kasturi said his movement had done nothing wrong and its members enjoyed freedom of movement under the laws of European countries.

"The Thais should also bear

in mind, in light of the European Convention on Human Rights, that we are here legally and have nothing to hide," he added.

Best Teacher jailed: The Nakhon Sri Thammarat Provincial Court on May 22 sentenced a winner of the national "Best Teacher 2005" award to nine years in prison for molesting a Prathom 5 student.

The court ruled that Amporn Suriya, a performance art teacher at a well-known primary school in the City of Nakhon Sri Thammarat, was guilty of luring a minor under 15 and molesting her.

The charges stated that in January 2005 Amporn took a 10-year-old student to his house, where he molested her.

In tears, the victim's father said he and his family were pleased with the sentence.

"The judgment assures us that there is still justice in society. This can help many girls who have been treated like my daughter," he said.

Amporn is expected to appeal the ruling.

ike store owner and triathlon team manager Alex Bok [see First Person, page 27 of this issue] makes the case that bicycles are the responsible way to travel – both for yourself and for the environment. Cycling can get you in shape, make your morning commute double as your daily workout and, with Phuket's beautiful weather, excuses are hard to find. Except, of course, the traffic.

But where in Phuket can you buy a decent bike, and what should you be looking for? And once you have the bike, where can you ride?

The first decision to make in a bicycle purchase is what you're going to use the bike for. Bicycles fall into three main categories: leisure (or cruising) bikes, road bikes or mountain bikes.

Leisure bikes aren't meant to go fast or be ridden hard, and often have a basket in front so you can carry your groceries back from market. This type of bike is best bought at Big C Supercenter or Tesco-Lotus, but it is the least efficient type of bike. With a limited gear range (or no gears at all), they are harder to pedal and won't make it through more than a small puddle on the road.

For more serious bicycles, the kind that will get you to work in decent time and give a more satisfying workout, road bikes and mountain bikes are the way to go. They are, of course, more expensive, ranging in price from about 8,000 baht for a child's bike to 10,000 baht for a basic adult bike.

The difference between the mountain and road bikes lies in their tires and the posture assumed while riding them. Road bikes have thin tires better for cruising over pavement and the frames are designed to keep riders down close to the handlebars to reduce drag.

Mountain bikes have wide, knobby tires to tear through mud

and up hillsides, and have sturdier frames with shocks built in to reduce the impact from bouncing along mountain trails.

While the color of the bike used to be the biggest determining factor in which bike to buy, there are now a dizzying array of options and accessories.

Luckily there are shop owners like Phaitoon "Toon" Chaiwatanamethin to help clear the way. K. Toon is the very knowledgeable owner of Thalang Bike on Thepkrasattri Rd, where he sells both road and mountain bikes. He speaks excellent English and works as the official mechanic of the Laguna Phuket Triathlon.

Also an avid biker, he explained why a good quality bike and proper bike maintenance can

make a ride much more enjoyable.

"On a good bike, when you are riding you can hear just the friction of the tire on the road – wshhhh – your heart beat – thump thump thump – and the occasional shifting of the gears – click... click

"But on a bad bike you hear everything." Here he makes a whole series of noises, including clanging chains, squeaking brakes and wrenching gears.

Buying a good bike is an investment, and there are several brand names that are favored in Phuket. Both K. Toon and Monprai "Kai" Sukchareun, the owner of Cross Country bike store in Tung Tong, say that Trek is their highest-recommended and most popular mountain bike brand, while Schwinn and Bianchi are popular road bikes.

Thalang Bike sells and services a whole range of brands, including Gary Fisher, Challenger, Klien, GT, Schwinn, Mongoose, Scott, Jamis and Thailandbased LA. Cross Country doesn't have as much in stock, but can order any of the bike brands that customers want, K. Kai said.

Mountain bike frames now come in two basic varieties – hardtail and full suspension. In a hardtail bike, the front fork has a set of shocks built in, while the full suspension bikes have rear suspension as well.

Alex Bok's The Bike Boutique, which is set to open in the Boat Lagoon by the end of the year, offers more high-end options including brands like On-One, Cervelo and Planet-X. These bikes can range from 10,000 baht for a hardtail mountain bike to around 75,000 for a road bike.

After you've selected the model you want, make sure to order the correct size. Incorrectly sized bikes are the biggest problem K. Toon sees with inexperienced riders, he said. To choose the right size frame, he recommends the rider stand over the bike and ensure the distance between the top bar and the rider's crotch is at least one inch.

Because women's bodies have different proportions from men's, K. Toon's shop also has Trek bikes for women; Trek is the only brand that offers a specific set for females, he explained.

Even after the style and size of the frame is selected, there is still the matter of components – that is, the shifters, brakes, chains, gears and tires – to consider.

When Trek sell a bicycle, they are responsible only for the frame and while many bikes come pre-assembled with standard parts, those are easily swapped and replaced to customers' specifications.

Both K. Kai and K. Toon said they find Shimano brand parts dominate the market. But within Shimano there is a wide variety of options. For mountain bikes, disk brakes are becoming more popular because they can stop the bike quickly and can be used even if the tire frame is bent, unlike the more popular rim brakes.

If all these options are too confusing or more bike than you wish to buy, sports stores like SportsWorld and Super Sports offer a smaller selection of preassembled bikes without the option of swapping parts.

After you have a bike you may notice the roads around Phuket aren't too inviting for bicycles. So, after donning your helmet, it is best to head off the major highways to a more relaxing corner of the island.

For road riding, triathlon Team TBB have found that riding around Bang Wad Dam provides clear roads and easy rides.

For more coastal rides, www.phuketdelight.com includes directions for scenic island tours – usually meant for cars but even more enjoyable on a bike.

The routes on t quieter roads in the northeast of the island are perhaps the best and safest.

For more guided adventures, Siam Bike Tours on Kata Beach organizes longer rides between Phuket and Bangkok, Ranong or the beautiful Khao Sok National Park in Surat Thani.

Once the checklist is completed – bicycle, good components, helmet, map with route direction, and sun – there's no reason not to enjoy Phuket at a slightly slower pace on two wheels.



With 174bhp of power and a the option of a six-speed manual gearbox, the 4X4 Navara brings a performance edge to the pickup market.

he Nissan Frontier has been around for a while but Nissan's share of the pickup market was as low as a paltry 5.6% in 2006.

Compare this with Toyota and Isuzu, who between them account for more than 75% of pickup sales. To combat these low numbers, Siam Nissan Automobile has introduced an updated model to its range: the new Nissan Navara.

Siam Nissan anticipates sales of 40,000 of the new Navara in 2007, helping the company achieve a more respectable market share.

Siam Nissan has now come under the direct control of Nissan Japan and there are plans to upgrade many of its dealers countrywide, some of which are desperately in need of redecoration and improved display facilities.

Frenchman Thierry Viadieu, president of Siam Nissan Automobile and a close associate of Carlos Ghosn, the boss of the Renault-Nissan alliance said. "This is a critical year for the Nissan business in Thailand, with the all-new Frontier Navara central to our growth in this key market.

"The Navara is one of three core products that will drive the brand and the business in 2007. In addition to the pickup, the Tiida compact and Teana premium sedan will be the start of a longterm new product offensive for Nissan in Thailand."

The new Navara is built at the Bangna Trad plant about 20 kilometers east of Bangkok and exports are expected to begin in the middle of the year, explained Mr Viadieu.



"We need to realign our resources to perform more efficiently," he said. "The Navara is our latest product and the innovative additions it brings to the pickup segment will allow us to capture the market share we require."

The engine in the fourwheel-drive Navara is a 2.5 liter common-rail diesel and with 174bhp (128kW), it is the most powerful pickup motor of its size available.

Maximum torque is equally impressive, peaking at 403Nm. The two-wheel drive Navara comes with a slightly less powerful 144bhp (106kW) 2.5 liter common-rail diesel.

On the inside, the pickup combines the comfort and command seating of an SUV with technology more commonly associated with a luxury sedan.

The Frontier Navara is the first pickup truck in Thailand to have six-speed manual transmission. A five-speed automatic gearbox is also available.

The Navara also features an electronically-controlled fourwheel-drive system with a limited slip differential. Utilizing "shift-on-the-fly" technology, it is possible to change from 2WD and 4WD with the use of a dial without stopping.

There are the inevitable varieties, from an entry-level single cab to the top-of-the-range double cab and either two- or fourwheel drive.

Nissan anticipates that Thailand will become a major production hub for the company and Mr Viadieu expects the Navara to contribute strongly to this aim.

"The Frontier Navara is cheaper than the Toyota Vigo and the Isuzu D-Max, the outright market leaders," he says.

Total pickup sales in Thailand this year are expected to top 400,000 units, from a total of around 700,000 automobile sales.

Nissan believes it will not be difficult to capture 10% of pickup sales and clearly wants to reestablish itself in the marketplace, despite the economic and political difficulties currently facing the Kingdom.

Strong competition will

new 2007 Hilux, as well as the revamped Mazda BT-50 and Ford Ranger. The outgoing Nissan Frontier is more than seven years old and an advanced replacement such as the Navara has been sorely needed for some time. Now it remains to be seen what the public think of the new machine.

The Navara starts at 569,000 baht for the two-wheel drive version and 669,000 baht for the four-wheel drive.

It is the Thai tradition for family members of a person who has died to move the body of their loved one to a temple for three, five or seven days before holding a cremation ceremony. In some cases, relatives choose to leave the body for 50 or 100 days to pay respect to the dead, but in Buddhist tradition – and following Buddha's example – nearly all of the bodies are cremated at the end of the mourning period.

The task of performing the cremations at Wat Kata falls to Boonkuer 'Daeng' Kongsana, a man who has garnered attention for his reverence for the bodies and his tradition of wearing a suit, tie and leather shoes to honor the deceased and those who come to mourn their passing. Gazette reporter **Supanun Supawong** asked K. Daeng about his work.



anning the crematorium at a temple may not be the most glamorous job in Phuket, but when no one else was around to perform the rites at Wat Kata (Kitti Sangkaram Temple) for a relative 10 years ago, Boonkuer "Daeng" Kongsana took up the task.

Again last year he decided to resume his position as crematorium attendant when called upon by a municipality official.

Phuket, raising two daughters and two sons while working as a construction worker and tree trimmer, jobs he continues to do when he is not working at Wat

"I started working at Wat Kata last September, because the temple built a new crematorium and needed a new attendant. The Karon Municipality Deputy Mayor persuaded me to work there," he said.

"I accepted immediately. I K. Daeng, 47, was born in now receive a salary of 6,000 baht

the job is because I think it is a worthwhile job, but one that not many people want to do. I remember 10 years ago when my relative was ready to be cremated, the attendant was busy, so I had to do the cremation ceremony myself.

"I don't fear ghosts or spirits. I've never seen any since I began doing this job. I just think, 'Why should we be afraid of ghosts?' Everyone must die."

K. Daeng explained that when a person dies, relatives inform the municipality, which in turn informs K. Daeng. At the ceremoney, he wears a white collared shirt and black pants as he serves refreshments to the

After that, at the cremation

ceremony, he dons his trademark suit and tie - highly unusual attire for a crematorium attendant in Thailand.

"Ever since I started working here I have worn a suit. At first people would look at me, thinking I was strange. One person even saluted me because they thought I was an official.

"There have been several magazines and newspapers that have come to interview me, but after a while I became accustomed to wearing the suit, so I wasn't as shy about it.

"Because the suit is quite thick fabric, it makes me hot and cramped on warm days. Now I have two suits, four white shirts and a pair of leather shoes that I bought with the money I am paid

from the job.

"The villagers here like the idea of me wearing a suit because it is different from everywhere else in Thailand. I heard that there are attendants in Nonthaburi and one other province who have copied me and now wear suits."

K. Daeng said that he is now the only crematorium attendant at Wat Kata, which in some months has no funeral services. In a busy month, however, he may attend three of four crema-

"My responsibility at the funeral is to clean the crematorium, prepare the offerings and cremation fuel, as well as collect the bones of the deceased and place them in an urn after it is over. When it's finished, the relatives usually tip me about 500 baht," he said.

Cremations take about two and a half hours using liquid fuels, as opposed to the four hours that it would take using the more traditional firewood.


K. Daeng said that even though he has to deal with the gruesome remains of accident victims and people who have died from terrible diseases, he has never been squeamish about handling corpses. In one case he cremated a person who had died from HIV/Aids, but he was not afraid because the doctors assured him it was safe.

"I remember one corpse that was most difficult to burn. It

was an old man from Phatthalung. Normally it takes about two and a half hours, but for him it took five hours. Many people there believe that because the old man dealt in black magic his skin and bones were difficult to burn."

K. Daeng said that while he is working he wears gloves and a mask. As a matter of routine, he always takes a shower and cleans his laundry after each cremation is finished. He wears the mask to protect himself from any diseases, he said.



Despite his constant dealings with the dead and the religious rituals that mark their passing, K. Daeng said that he prefers to go fishing with his friends in his free time – rather than read scriptures or other religious doctrines.


Even though this job doesn't pay well, K. Daeng said that his family supports him because he is doing good deeds and making merit.

He will continue to work as the Wat Kata attendant for as long as he can, he told the *Gazette*.

"Everyone must die, so while I'm alive I want to do something to help society," he explained. "Being a crematorium attendant is a job that no one wants to do. People who do this job have to be unafraid of dead bodies and they have to have a good heart. They have to do the job because they want to, not for the money," he said.



his year's musthave hot weather garment for women is a dress. The summer collections, always the best option for fashionconscious Phuket residents, regardless of the season, are offering a dress to fit every body type, every occasion and every budget.

The leading trends this season are coat-style dresses with a button-close front, Empire-waist dresses, sheath dresses, wrap-around dresses, floral-pattern dresses, African-themed dresses and graphic prints. Plain- and solid-colored dresses also are in style.

The new appreciation for dresses has something to do with the spirit of the times, said Gudrun Allstaedt, editor of a textile trade magazine. Dresses were once thought of not only as square, but also as impractical, she said.

"A blouse and skirt were easier to combine and didn't look as dowdy," Ms Allstaedt added. That's now changed.

There also were aesthetic reasons opposing the dress, specifically that they don't flatter every body shape

"As with boots, dresses bring together several dimensions," said style adviser Maria Hans. Some women are bigger in the shoulders and breasts, others have rounder bellies, legs and hips. Current styles help with these issues, in particular, the wrap-around dress.

Introduced 30 years ago by designer Diane von Furstenberg, the wraparound dress was rediscovered a few years ago by models and Hollywood stars. This year, wrap-around dresses can be found again

in every boutique and department store, and not just in the original version. The fashion house Esprit, for example, has several variations. Whether the dress features a solid color, floral pattern, vertical stripe or geometric pattern, in every case a thin, light cotton belt ties at the waist.

"The absolutely hot wrap-around dresses drape nicely around just about every shape due to their cut and the soft fabric typically used," said Hans. And women who choose a trendy pattern can cleverly conceal problem zones.

New coat dresses such as the ones in designer Betty Barclay's collection can be easily combined in multiple variations. An important feature of every dress is a belt that emphasizes the waist. The collection includes neutrals, colors and strong contrasts.

The dress can be worn coat-like over another garment as well, said Frankfurt-based style adviser Andreas Rose. It can also be worn open over a pair of hotpants and high heels. Women with less courage can wear it over summer trousers or even a summer skirt.

"It's the game of length and width," said Mr Rose, describing the current style. Accordingly, a long-sleeved shirt may be worn under a short-sleeved dress or a wide-knit jacket can be worn over it. Wide belts that sit high on the waist offer numerous variation possibilities.

"Nearly every fashion house has a dress with an Empire waist in its collection particularly for younger women," added Mr Rose. Nude tones dominate the designs, although there also are some in black and white and in natural colors. The fabrics used are light and airy

Go-go

eingut Gunderloch vintner Fritz Hasselbach is maker of one of Germany's finest wines, and husband of Gunderloch boss Agnes Hasselbach.

Seated at the center of Amari Coral Beach Resort's surprisingly long banquet table, Mr Hasselbach was guest of honor for the evening – having brought the wine – and remained affable despite pestering from a table-full of tropical oenophiles.

"Of the six wines tasted tonight, only one seemed characteristically German, the auslese, and that was served in a tiny glass as a dessert wine," said one. "Please explain."

Mr Hasselbach noted sheepishly that the wine would have been better were the glass bigger: "Riesling always needs air," he explained, "so bigger glasses are better."

He then launched into an illuminating critique of Germany's famous wine laws: "Simply because a wine has fewer than nine grams of sugar, I can't say it is therefore dry," he opined. Nor would he assert that because a wine has more sugar it is sweet: "My [Riesling] Red Stone has 15 grams of sugar – making it a dessert wine by law; yet to me it tastes dry. So I don't care about wine laws. I strive always for balance."


Mr Hasselbach also strives to avoid the curse of corked wine by using screw caps. In the fine wine business that is daring. But, as wine industry research shows roughly 20% of corks go bad, it is prudent; and evidence of an emerging trend.

The peculiar character of the wines Mr Hasselbach brought - two white Burgundy-style wines; two Rieslings of unmistakable aridity; one semi-dry; and the superb auslese (German for "selected bunches") — probably had more to do with Thai tax laws than with the German wine code (created to ensure that the country's wines, famous for their sweetness, would be so without addition of sugar). The wines are typically made of Riesling grapes, not of Pinot Gris or Pinot Blanc, both of which are cloned from Pinot Noir - the great grape of Burgundy, not Germany.

Thailand, though, is a haven for such rarities.

Hans-Peter Blumer, whose company Black Forest is Gunderloch's distributor in Thailand, notes on his website: "A wine ends up in Black Forest's [catalog] only if it is an absolute quality-price ratio leader." The reason for such economy is simple: "Tax on wine now stands at 400%." Cheap wine overseas thus becomes expensive here — and expensive wine becomes unthinkable.

Take for example Gunderloch's greatest wine, the Nackenheim Rothenberg Trocken-

beeren Auslese, a late harvest wine using grapes afflicted with the "noble rot", Botrytis cinerea. This mold dehydrates the grapes considerably on the vine, thereby concentrating sugar, fruit acids and minerals. The resulting wines, known as trockenbeeren wines. are redolent of honeysuckle, complex to make, scarce, and never cheap.

Gunderloch's Nackenheim Rothenberg has received perfect scores for three vintages' - '92, '96, '01 – from the influential Wine Spectator magazine, which uses a 100point rating system. Such scores are extremely rare; only a few bottles each year score 100 points. Gunderloch's 2002 Nackenheim Rothenberg Trockenbeeren Auslese earned 98 points – and on the world market cases of 370ml half-bottles sell for US\$2,819 each; bottles retail in American wine shops for up to US\$335.

But in Thailand, 400% taxation mandates they sell for US\$1,340 each, or about 45,000 baht per half-bottle. Other fine wines are similarly priced, so we don't often see them; and vintners are inclined to off-load freaks. "The Rothenberg Riesling 'Goldkapsel' Auslese we tasted tonight tested out as trockenbeeren wine," he explained, "and I might have marketed it as such legally. But it didn't taste sweet enough to me. So I de-classified it. It's still a fine dessert wine, but far less costly."

The Coral Beach tasting featured an evening of rarities. Black Forest's Mr Blumer had organized the event, inviting several distinguished gourmands, the odd raconteur, and many serious wine people.

Picture this if you can: the lights dimmed, Freddy Mercury and Queen began belting out "We will, we will rock you!", and a line of red and black-robed chefs were seen grooving to the beat as they prepared Grilled Scallop and Asparagus Salad with Nori Caviar amid the smoke of melting dry ice. Go-go dancers did the frug on tiled counters behind.

Rare.

It all began innocently enough with Gunderloch's excellent Riesling 2004 and a portion of Phuket's wine coterie assembled on the patio outside Amari Coral Beach Resort's Rim Talay restaurant. Phuket.com's Neil Cummings and wife Linda were there; so was The 9th Floor Restaurant and Bar's Thomas Brack; Le Meridien Khao Lak Beach Resort food and beverage manager Maria Steckermeier; Phuket Art Advertising's Sasithorn Akkarawanichsil; and Tropica hotel proprietor Hans-Jurgen 'Giorgio' Gompf – among others, gathered for the most part round two chromium containers of quiche-like Elzasser onion pies.



The low-key affair introduced not only Gunderloch's wines to the Phuket market but showcased the Coral Beach kitchen's ability to turn out a banquet of truly novel cuisine for 50 guests. Each dish was crafted to complement its accompanying wine, rather than the reverse an eclectic approach that paid off. Also novel, in this Age of Obesity, was the seven-course menu's preponderance of nonfattening ingredients.

After an hour of jaw-boning, admiring the sprawling hotel's tasteful renovations, and enjoying the fine, un-amplified performance of the four-piece group led by guitarists Lito Lopez and

Patrick Niserio, we entered the Rim Talay's open air pavilion. Our first course was lobster and papaya salad, which accompanied Gunderloch's 2004 Weissburgunder, made from Pinot Blanc.

The latter is a grape historically identified with Burgundy (hence the name) but now found more often in Italy, Alsace, Germany and Austria. Gunderloch's wine, from 60-year-old vines, was nicely balanced but austere - that is, "focused" in wine parlance, a by-product of its tannins and acids. These, however, inasmuch as they contribute to digestion, make it an excellent "food wine".

Second course was grilled

Scallop and White Asparagus er balance in pairing his dishes. with Nori Caviar and 2005 Grauburgunder ("Gray Burgundy"), made of Pinot Gris. That wine's aroma was slight, reminiscent of oranges, but its robe was colored a deeper yellow than the ultrapale Weissburgunder; its flavor was more acidic.

Either of these relatively unknown German wines is a smart substitute for Chablis, which they both resemble. The Germans are also far less costly and more reliable, having none of the off-odor loss-leader editions of which famous French wines

The presence of rare white asparagus on our plates prompted the Teutons at table to rhapsodize on the vegetable's noble qualities. "It grows beneath the ground and costs more than meat," said Giorgio, who, after 27 years in Patong, is doyen of the tambon's foreign tourism operators. Other heads nodded sagely in approbation. "I used to visit Germany during the asparagus season just to eat white asparagus – it's available only from the end of April till mid-June."

All agreed that, aside from its specially delicious character, white asparagus shares a common characteristic with the King of Fruits: "It's something like durian," Giorgio observed, "but only in that when you pee it smells: because it's cleaning your kid-

A 2005 Riesling Kabinett, a spatlese (or "late-picking") identified as "Jean Baptiste", was served with two dishes: whipped pink lentils and sweet potato; and snowfish fillet in extra olive oil bell pepper ragout.

Kabinett is the most typical of German wines – flowery, fruity, and slightly sweet. This was arid and oak-ish – but the chef nevertheless found the propOne guest, however, 43-year-old Beat Schmidlin of Basel, argued that merely dicing the bell peppers was too simple: "I'd make a comfit of them - coating them with jam or sugar," he declared. "That would be better."

Armchair gourmets, like retired generals, always have a superior strategy.


One should perhaps have been employed for the next pairing, Gunderloch's 2005 Red Stone Riesling and a braised veal and tom yam prawn roll. The veal and prawn roll savored of salt; the Red Stone – colored a deep yellow but tinged with red from the mineral-laden slate in which the grapes grew – was strangely dry. It was a match made in Thailand – not in heaven.

Next on the menu from Amari's executive chef, German Alexander Mack, was physalis, also called ground cherry. It is something like an orange-hued tomato, but sheathed in a papery husk. It's good in salads and reputedly soothes a sore throat as well. We had it caramelized, with ice cream covered in an iced-Riesling foam, alongside a dessert thimble of the delightful 2005 Rothenberg "Goldkapsel" Riesling Auslese: a perfect match.

In the meantime, dry ice fumed; commis and pastry cooks frugged on the kitchen counters; and Joey Tempest bawled out the Final Countdown. Various of our number rose to the occasion and congratulated us on our good sense for being there.

It is worth considering that German wine hitherto has met with few buyers in Phuket, prices being what they are. Mr Hasselbach's visit showed that at least one great vintner will do what he can to reach this market, however much..um, eclecticism is required.





leep is essential for concentration, memory, happiness and wellbeing. But let's face it, even though we spend a third of our adult lives asleep, we take it for granted – until we can't get it.

Women tend to suffer from insomnia more than men, and when it hits it can wreak havoc on your work, social life, and relationships.


Here are some tips I have picked up after years of never getting enough sleep.

Keep a sleep diary: If you have problems sleeping, keep a diary of what you do during the day and what your sleeping patterns are. Sleeplessness can be caused by depression and anxiety. If this is the problem, it's best to treat the root cause and sleep will follow naturally. Even waking early in the morning can be a symptom of depression.

What you do before you go to bed is important. If you have a problem getting to sleep, your mind may be overstimulated. Watching television in bed, latenight phone calls or working until just before bedtime can all cause problems. Conversely, you may see making love as the most stimulating pursuit imaginable, but it can often help you get a good night's sleep.

Establish a routine: Adults as well as babies associate various environmental and nutritional cues with sleep. If you have a nightly routine, your body will start preparing itself for sleep. For example, if you always drink a cup of herbal tea while listening to calming music, go through a cleansing routine and then brush your teeth, your body will start to recognize your habit and wind down accordingly.

Regular bedtimes are also essential if you have problems sleeping. If you can't get to sleep or you wake up in the night, go to bed later but set your alarm clock for the same time. This takes the

pressure off getting a good, long night's sleep and starts to train you to fall asleep more quickly and to sleep well for a shorter time. Gradually move your bedtime forward by 15 minutes until you're sleeping the right amount for you.

Sleep in a dark room: I hate light in my bedroom. Darkness stimulates the production of the

brain's melatonin, which encourages sleep. Your eyelids let through 80 per cent of light, so if you haven't got heavy curtains, wear an eye mask to block excess light.

Make a sleep sandwich: Avoid a heavy meal just before going to bed as this can keep you awake. If you really have to eat, make yourself a sleep sandwich. Put some sliced banana, yeast extract and lettuce between two slices of wholegrain bread - I know it sounds yuk, but it works. Lettuce has been considered an opiate since Roman times, and yeast extract and banana stimulate the production of amino acids which play an important role in the biochemical mechanism of sleep – according to the experts.

Keep your bedroom cool: Body temperature is fundamental to a good night's sleep. As your body prepares to drift off, you start losing heat through your face, hands and feet. If your bedroom is too hot you will be unable to lose heat adequately—which will result in a broken night.

The myth that women need more sleep may have come about because a woman's hormonal fluctuations lead to a rise in body temperature. This is why it is particularly important for women not to sleep in a warm bedroom, particularly around the time of their period.

Have a warm bath: Oddly enough, a warm bath is a great sleep aid. Your body temperature



will, in fact, drop after a good long soak. Add some sleep-inducing essential oils to your bath such as lavender, geranium and clarysage.

Think about what you drink: Although a small glass of wine may help you relax, too much alcohol can result in broken sleep. Caffeine should be avoided where possible. If you love caffeine, drink coffee in the morning and tea in the afternoon.

Avoid both at night and, if you really can't do without something, drink chocolate instead. A hot milky drink can be comforting at bedtime – the maternal associations are said to give a sense of well-being, promoting relaxation and sleep. There are also various herbal "bedtime" teas on the market.


Use your imagination: Visualization can help send you off when you're feeling stressed and your mind is in a spin. Imagine a relaxing scenario – perhaps lying on the beach. Focus on the noises, the smells and the sounds you can hear and feel the heat of the sun. You will drift off in no time.

Breathe: Abdominal breathing can help you relax, getting you in the right frame of mind to sleep. Meditation is another way of stilling an overactive mind, and it will help you regulate your breathing.

Exercise – the right kind can help: Exercise during the day. It elevates your mood, releases stress and tires you physically so it's an ideal way to promote healthy sleep patterns. But avoid exercising too close to bedtime as this raises body temperature and releases adrenalin, which hinders sleep. Yoga is a great form of exercise if you suffer from sleep problems, since it is an ideal way of relaxing both body and mind.

A good romp between the sheets: It really does help. A good sex session relaxes the muscles and relieves stress. Whether it's with your partner or on your own it will always induce a good sleep afterwards!

here are two things about Thailand that stand out as being incomprehensible to Westerners: Buddhism and road rules.

When we meditate on this we find that the two are inextricably linked, Little Grasshopper. By understanding the one you gain insight into the other.

Here then, are some lessons to ponder as you travel the road to enlightenment.

Duality is a Myth: Western religions are burdened with the concept of opposites: good or evil, light or dark, original or extracrispy. To follow the way of the Thai driver you too must cast off these illusions of duality, such as the duality of two traffic lanes moving in opposite directions.


Are both lanes not part of one road? Are both directions not still expressions of the eternal flow of all things?



Zen and the art of motorcycle madness





As one's soul gains experience and enlightenment from each lifetime one is reincarnated into yet another lifetime, until nirvana is achieved and one escapes from this eternal cycle into a state of perpetual bliss.

You never die, as life is a mere Honda dream, instead you simply pass into another life for another chance to attain the wisdom necessary for enlighten-

You should never fear death, even when careening along a twisty Phuket highway at 200km an hour with a bottomless chasm yawing right next to the road. This life will end when it is time.

No matter how many times you check your mirrors, a car can come screaming up from your blind spot and make that time NOW.

Accept this as inevitable and you will be free to follow the

way of the Thai driver, overtaking on blind corners and driving in the rain at breakneck speeds without a helmet.

HURRICANE HORROR

reach of Faith (Random House, New York, 2006, 412pp) is the story, as the subtitle has it, of "Hurricane Katrina and the Near Death of a Great American City". Metro editor of The Times-Picayune, author Jed Horne was awarded a Pulitzer Prize for his part in the New Orleans newspaper's coverage of the great disaster.

"Katrina erased neighborhoods across hundreds of square miles and wrought devastation in a surrounding area the size of Great Britain, 90,000 square miles, all told," Horne writes.

"It tossed about giant floating casinos like dice on a craps table, snapped 200foot-tall pine stands with the ease of a scythe passing through dried hay, collapsed a million-dollar oil storage tank in Chalmette as though it were a beer can under a frat boy's loafer."

New Orleans, an area five times the size of Manhattan, laid underwater. Rooftops poked above the dark and poisonous swill: a brew that mixed sewage, industrial chemicals, and gasoline.

Flooded houses numbered 250,000, abandoned cars 50,000. But more than the statistics, Horne brings the story down to its human dimensions by hundreds of interviews with survivors.

In particular he tracks the fate of a dozen families – white, black, rich, poor – from the day before the storm hit to weeks afterward.

Patrina Peters, a retired teacher and matriarch of an extended family sharing a



house in the mostly black and poor Ninth Ward, sees off her family the day before the storm but stays on with her daughter

When Katrina breaches the levies of Lake Pontchartrain, they wind up trapped on the roof of their collapsing home, saving their lives only by jumping on the roof of another house floating past.

Meanwhile, FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) chief Michael Brown was dining well at a steak house in Baton Rouge, oblivious to frantic telephone calls from his man on the ground in the New Orleans Superdome, soon to be turned into a reeking sump hole of overcrowded, sick and hungry refugees.

Brown would later be exposed as a notoriously incompetent political hack and ousted in disgrace.

"Fortunately, as FEMA brass dithered and dined well, an armada of small craft had begun fanning out over the floodcue mission," Horne writes.

One of these was Stephen Ford, a shipyard carpenter and crab fisherman, ident was Lyndon Johnson. 40 years later,

who launched his pirogue to the rescue.

"God opened my eyes to many things during the storm," he said. "He allowed me to see the humanness of everybody and what I needed to do and how I needed to be – at least a snapshot of how I should be.'

It was Ford who rescued Patrina and Keia Peters from their foundering rooftop.

There were many instances of heroism by rescuers, doctors, nurses, emergency medical technicians and police. On the con-

trary, there were also numerous cases of looting and rape by rampaging mobs. Not only did hundreds of police desert their posts but many led the looting.

Ditherer-in-chief was President George W. Bush.

"White and black, exhausted and hungry, the New Orleanians were still huddled in a shelter the day after a terrible hurricane when the president, a Texan, stood among them, turned a flashlight onto

Fantasy island?

The surprise announcement by Royal Phuket Marina (RPM) developer Gulu Lalvani that he plans to build "Zoran Island" off the coast of Koh Kaew to berth mega-yachts (see News pages) has elicited a wide range of responses locally.

Reactions have included charges that the announcement was little more than a brilliant marketing ploy, meant to draw media attention to his ongoing condominium project at RPM, as well as outraged cries calling for the perceived excesses of the world's super-rich to be curtailed in the face of global warming.

Lost somewhere in all the rhetoric is what appears to be a truly heartfelt call by Mr Lalvani to use Phuket as a springboard to develop the entire Phang Nga Bay area to what he views as its full potential for marine tourism – and that potential is great indeed.

Mr Lalvani is keenly aware that Phang Nga Bay, with its yearround warm water and dramatic karst landscapes, has all the ingredients needed to serve as an Asian version of the Mediterranean, where the world's richest people can escape aboard their megayachts to enjoy some of the recreational privacy the rest of us take for granted.

While news that Bill Gates was unable to find a place to berth his 54-meter yacht in Phuket is unlikely to elicit pity in most of us, the fact that he was able to cruise around Phang Nga Bay for two weeks undetected by the Thai and international media says quite a bit about the area's attractiveness to that market.

While Phang Nga Bay has great potential for marine tourism, there remains an enormous amount of work that needs to be done first.

Despite last month being named "Maritime Capital of Asia", the current state of the infrastructure in and around Phuket waters is still woefully inadequate by Western standards. Channels to some of the most well-known ports still consist of little more than bamboo polls hammered into the muddy seabed, while the network of lighted navigational aids such as flashing buoys can only be described as primitive.

As for Zoran Island, apart from some impressive computergenerated graphics depicting what it would look like, there has still been insufficient information regarding where the enormous amount of material needed to construct it would be sourced.

Perhaps what is left of the mountain of red tape that Mr Lalvani will need to cut though for the project to win government approval should be considered.

Getting your life into gear

t is clear that impressive economic growth in Asia over the past 10 years has been detrimental to the environment. More then 240 million people throughout Asia have been lifted from poverty to a middle-income class which, in itself, is a wonderful thing. However, this increase in quality of life has come with the significant cost of poor air quality levels seen in major cities all over Asia, including Hong Kong, Beijing and Jakarta to name just a few.

Thailand, which is no exception, has had to deal with similar issues affecting areas that have seen rapid expansion. Bangkok continues to struggle with unhealthy air quality and even our beautiful island of Phuket, with no heavy industry, is starting to show adverse effects as a result of significant increases in the number of cars and motorbikes. In addition to the environmental impact, this also heightens the danger of commuting. A simple look at traffic accident statistics is enough evidence to prove this point.

While many people are earning higher incomes and can afford private vehicles, what practical, low-cost solutions can we take to minimize the environmental impact?

Thinking and talking about this dilemma is done all too often, but usually brings about minimal action. Instead of taking this route of inactivity, we have decided to establish a bike movement in Singapore called "iwant2bike2work" with the intention of it spreading across Asia.

As a non-profit organization, the sole purpose of "iwant2-bike2work" is to get people to ride

bicycles for their daily work commute. We want to make cycling sustainable in urban areas of Asia in order to provide accessibility, such as by providing workers a place to store bikes, take showers and change before going into the office. We also want to promote cycling as a rewarding way of staying healthy – including making roads safer and more convenient for cyclists.

This bike movement is fronted and sponsored by The Bike Boutique, a regional bike lifestyle franchise and Asia's #1 online bike store. Since The Bike Boutique will be opening a brand new bike boutique at Boat Lagoon in Phuket, the bike movement "iwant2bike2work" will

also be introduced to the Phuket area.

What will be a real challenge for Phuket is enabling people to ride safely on the roads, park their bike in a safe place, have access to showers and be able to walk to their place of work.

These are the problems we face in every city where we introduce the "iwant2bike2work" concept, although each location of course poses its own unique set of specific challenges. It is for this reason that the movement has prepared a generic roadmap that is applicable to every city and through which we hope our vision will become reality.

After successful discussions held with government bodies, cyclists in Singapore are now able to use the bus lanes that lead into the city's central business district.

In a joint effort with The Bike Boutique, a new "bikeLodging" service was launched enabling commuters to park their bike, take a shower, purchase a beverage and walk to their workplace. The movement has received a significant amount of supportive media coverage, which has inspired curious individuals to bike to work as well.

Starting from a grassroots base, the current results show that a bike movement like the one in Singapore could lead to a serious shift toward a healthier, more eco-friendly lifestyle. More than 75 people currently bike to work each day in Singapore. Many never considered this alternative before the bike movement was launched. We have already seen that more people are becoming interested in the movement and are actively looking to make the change in their own lives.

In every place where the movement was initiated, critics claimed it would never work. The roads were not safe enough and people nowadays prefer the convenience of cars and motorbikes, they said. However, these same critics lacked concrete solutions to address the challenges facings our environment.

Despite their challenges, critics are useful in forcing us to think of ways we can reduce the public adversity to bike commuting.

The bikeLodging service was pioneered by The Bike Boutique and has been slowly removing many of the concerns related to bike commuting. The goal of the movement is simply to make commuting by bicycle so convenient that it becomes irresistible.

It's our most sincere hope that people who live and work in Phuket will be willing to embrace and promote the bike commuting movement and that, over the course of time, more and more people will see that life and the environment will be enriched with more bicycles and fewer cars on the road.

New visa extension requirements

I have an O-visa (marriage/dependants visa) that I have extended annually for the last seven years. A condition for extension has been to have a certain level of funds in a Thai bank account for at least three months before application. Alternatively, income such as a pension may substitute for the bank funds.

Apparently, beginning next year only proof of income will apply and it won't matter about the amount of any funds in a Thai account. Proof of income must apparently come from one's embassy but this in practice may be quite hard to do. For example, I have not been "home" for 10 years and have no income from there. Most expatriates normally have their savings offshore.

I am concerned about the uncertainties and wish to make plans to move away in good time, if an extension next year will not be possible. I don't want to go back to regular tourist visa runs. Can someone confirm the new

Does income have to be remitted to Thailand as proof of receipt? Can "income" be remitted capital savings from overseas? Do the embassies know what will be required of them?

Pol Capt Krissarat Nuesen of the Phuket Provincial Immigration Office replies:

For people who came to Thailand and had a permit to stay

for marriage before October 1, 2006, you need to present only your bank account, which must have not less than 400,000 baht. This amount must be on deposit in the bank more than three months before applying for the permit to stay. With this money deposited in the bank, you won't need to show monthly income.

Alternatively, if you have an income, it doesn't matter if it is from outside Thailand or not, the monthly income must not be less than 40,000 baht per month. If you have a business here in Thailand, the tax payment documents can be shown and must indicate an average income of not less than 40,000 baht per month.

If you want to show that you have an income or pension from outside the country, you must show a document from your home country's embassy indicating the amount of the income or pension, but this may be difficult because some embassies don't consider this their responsibility.

Perform a checklist of areas such as Phuket City and Patong concerning such aspects as ease of riding, road safety, access to safe parking, proper road signs and so on. he Soi Dog Foundation (SDF) is appealing for more volunteers to assist them in their work. SDF's aim is to reduce the number of stray dogs and cats in Phuket through mass sterilization and to improve the condition and lives of the remaining strays.

They have now sterilized over 16,000 dogs and cats in Phuket and, in conjunction with the government, are running a shelter and re-homing center housing more than 400 stray dogs and puppies.

"We simply could not function without volunteers," says SDF spokesperson Gill Dalley. "The cost of running the shelter and maintaining our sterilization and treatment programs is immense. Sadly, unless we can generate more income we will have to slow down the number of sterilizations we currently perform. The stray dog population on the island has reduced significantly and the last thing we want to see is for this trend to reverse. This is why we need more volunteers, whether it be to work hands on with the dogs, in the background taking care of administration or, of course, in fund raising, without which we could not operate. SDF relies totally on donations."

Current volunteers come from all walks of life and many different countries including the UK, USA, South Africa, Germany, Australia, Switzerland and Japan. Some are retired while others work full time, such as Tomoko Seino, from Japan, who works at the JW Marriott but still gives up one day a week to help the dogs.

I spoke with one of the volunteers, Kathy Kramer, to find out what opportunities are available and what types of people they are looking for.

Kathy is a retired teacher from the US who is now living in Khok Kloy in Phang Nga Province with her husband Rick who teaches at the Prince of Songkla

University Phuket Campus. She previously ran a grooming salon and a five-star boarding kennel in her native Montana.

Rick was at the shelter every day for three weeks last month constructing a volunteer center which was featured on TV when renowned Thai artists Wacharin and Jay-Da Rodnit spent a day there decorating the exterior.

"We are looking for people who have some free time and are looking to do something that will help the community while at the same time giving them a real sense of satisfaction that they are making a difference. We desperately need more volunteers who can commit to a day or even half a day each week to work at our

shelter and re-homing center.

"With the amount of activity that the shelter manager and her staff are involved in every day feeding more than 400 dogs, running errands to the veterinarian and buying supplies, not to mention trucks arriving with yet more strays each day, it is little wonder that details simply don't get taken care of. The staff, while committed, is small and the number of dogs and tasks to be performed often seems overwhelming," Kathy said.

Among the tasks that need to be fulfilled are weekly health checks. Volunteer Cristy Baker, from Australia, is concentrating on this but needs more help, as it is a mammoth task.

Other tasks include bathing, grooming, training, walking, and petting, which is an important role since most dogs need to be touched. Sue Hodgson from the UK looks after the puppies, many of which were abandoned and need special care. Rosemary Rerat from Switzerland comes several days a week just to walk and exercise the dogs who love the one-on-one attention.

An agility area has been set up for training and exercising purposes. Volunteer Sonia De Koch, who trained dogs professionally in her native South Africa, runs this side of things and is happy to train other volunteers in the art.

Another area where volunteers are needed is in assisting the vets who visit the clinic to perform sterilizations and other surgical procedures. No experience is necessary in any of these tasks as training will be given.

For those who want to vol-

unteer but find working directly with dogs a little daunting, the foundation has many other areas where help is needed. Fund raising is vitally important. Presently the majority of the funding comes from overseas and is insufficient to support what the foundation needs to do. Maxine Kent, from the UK, organized this year's major fund raising event but will be returning to the UK in the near future. People who can help in this area are desperately needed, whether it is being directly in-

volved in raising funds or seeking out donations of food and medical supplies.

"One of MAKINGTRACKS our volunteers, Heather Richmond, from the

UK, does not particularly like dogs and certainly doesn't like handling them. She does, however, understand the importance of what we are trying to do. She loves counting money, making her more than happy to spend a few hours each month counting up what we collect in donation boxes around the island. She is here for only six months of the year, therefore we need somebody with bookkeeping experience to manage the accounts and prepare them for our auditors," Kathy explained.

People with computer skills are needed to monitor our shelter database since the British Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (RSPCA) recently donated microchips enabling SDF to keep better track of the dogs. IT-savvy volunteers

are also needed to correspond with overseas supporters and provide them with updates. Current Webmaster, Sarah Heaney, actually spends only two weeks per year in Phuket. She runs the website from Saudi Arabia where her husband is working.

"We are also looking forward to starting an education program in local schools and to establish dog visits to special schools. Native Thai speakers are needed for this to move forward.

"One of the things that has

been happening in the US in recent years is that nursing homes for the elderly or long-term care facilities for people who cannot care for them-

selves are now having resident dogs live there. Just having a dog to pet and get to know has made a huge difference in these people's lives. Some children's wards in hospitals now also have resident dogs who roam the halls and pop in to see the children in their hospital rooms. I don't know if Thailand is ready for such a concept, but it's working very well in the US," Kathy said.

"So as you can see the possibilities are endless. We can guarantee that you won't get rich financially doing this work but the rewards in other ways are immense," she enthused.

By day I attended the giant HOFEX food and baking convention. By night I ventured out into the geek wilds – primarily Mong Kok Computer Center and the Wanchai Computer Center.

Not for the faint of heart, the two claustrophobic multistory computer malls churn with crowds of geeky, smelly, pushy shoppers.

Three weeks ago I wrote about the rather dismal state of affairs in the Singapore computer markets. I called the column "Singapore Slung" – and I'll stick by my original assessment. Prices for high tech consumer gear in Singapore, at this point, are not significantly lower than in Panthip Plaza in Bangkok.

New technology doesn't get into Singapore much faster than it does here. It's possible that the whole thing's a temporary aberration caused by price imbalances for Windows Vista and the latest chips from Intel and AMD. The situation could change next month. But for now, I don't see any real advantage in flying to Singapore to pick up tech equipment.

Several of you wrote reinforcing my reservations. Reader ZF said, "I appreciated the heads up before I went to Singapore and you can add telephoto camera lenses to the list of things more expensive there than they are in Phuket or the States. They had all the newest lens iterations, but for me, just looking for a low-priced Canon or Sigma lens, they didn't have much to offer."

With Singapore off my techie "A" list, I approached the markets in Hong Kong with some degree of trepidation. I'm more than a little relieved to report that Hong Kong prices, in general, run 10% to 30% cheaper than Panthip, and thus much cheaper than Phuket. Interesting new technology seems to show up in Europe and North America before it hits Hong Kong though. Hong Kong no longer sells the latest and greatest.

An example, if you will. In order to write my next book, I

need to run Microsoft's Xbox 360. While most of you may think of the Xbox 360 as a slightly souped-up Nintendo, in fact it goes way beyond simple shoot-em-ups and Internet-based role playing games.

The Xbox persona I have to deal with in the book goes by the geeky name "media extender." In short, you hook your Xbox 360 up to your TV and to your home network. The Xbox can then reach into sufficiently advanced Windows PCs and "stream" videos and music stored on those PCs.

There are many permutations, but the most obvious application here in Phuket involves hooking your Media Center or Vista Home Premium computer up to your UBC box, recording TV shows and storing them on the Media Center PC.

Then, with the Xbox connected to any TV anywhere in your house, the Xbox can reach into the library of recorded TV shows on the Media Center PC and play them back on the remote TV. That's just one of a wide array of Xbox 360 media extender capabilities.

Two months ago, Microsoft announced a new version of the Xbox 360, called the Xbox 360 Elite. It's available all over North America, but you can't find one in Hong Kong (or the rest of Asia, for that matter). The distributors in Hong Kong don't have a clue when the Elite will hit its shores.

A bit disappointed, I picked up a "classic" (read: obsolete) Xbox 360 in Hong Kong for HK \$2,960, or about

12,400 baht. Yesterday, I saw precisely the same machine for sale at a kiosk in Jung-

ceylon for 22,900 baht. A friend, ES, tells me that you can get them as low as 16,000 baht in Phuket City. That's 30% higher than the Hong Kong price.

A similar story. Two weeks before I flew to Hong Kong, Canon announced availability of its new IXUS-950 IS point-and-shoot camera. (Confusingly, the same camera is called the SD850 in the United States.) While you can buy IXUS 950 IS cameras in Europe, there are exactly none for sale in Hong Kong – and the dealers don't expect to see any for at least a couple of

months.

I wanted an IXUS 950 IS, but I settled on an IXUS 75, which costs HK \$2,480 (about 10,400 baht) including a 2GB memory card and an extra battery. The same camera at Power Buy in Phuket costs 13,900 baht, or 34% more, and that includes only a 1GB memory card and one battery.

I also found the selection of laptops in Hong Kong to be a half-step behind the ones widely available in the US and Europe.

Prices in Hong Kong were considerably higher, too, and very few laptops came with Windows Home Premium pre-installed, opting instead for the cheaper and much less capable Windows Home Basic.

I looked all over Hong Kong for a wireless router that would work with CAT's EV-DO AirCard 580. Hong Kong's monopoly telephone company, which provides excellent wired broadband access, hasn't yet caught up with the rest of the world and started installing third

generation mobile phone technology.

There's no EV-DO in HK – a fact that's truly

astounding when you realize that Huawei, the company that provides CAT's third-generation phone equipment, has its head-quarters in Shenzhen, a stone's throw away from Hong Kong.

So, in my opinion, Hong Kong at the moment is a mixed bag. If you can find what you want – and you aren't looking for a laptop – the prices are great. But for now, Hong Kong hasn't caught up with North America or Europe technologically.

For those of you who asked: yes, I did bring a glorious 27-inch widescreen Dell monitor back with me. It's huge and heavy. I had to disassemble the base with a T10 Torx driver and schlep the naked panel as a ponderous "garment bag." I paid HK \$8,888 (about 37,200 baht) for the monitor. The price in Thailand is about 40% higher.

Infrastructure needs high on Nation seminar agenda

PHUKET CITY: The need for improved infrastructure and resource management were highlighted at "The Drivers of the Economy in Phuket" seminar held at The Metropole hotel May 25.

The sold-out event, part of activities to mark the Nation Group's 36th anniversary, drew many notable speakers from government, industry and tourism sectors to discuss challenges facing the Phuket economy.

Speakers included Phuket Vice-Governor Smith Palawatvichai, Phuket Chamber of Commerce Chairman Eam Thavornwongwongse and President of

Chapter Methee Tanmanatragul, among others.

V/Gov Smith emphasized the need for a comprehensive plan for Phuket's growth by saying, "Growth without a plan for the future is suicide.

"Phuket is growing very fast, and there are many people, both Thai and foreign, who visit [the island].

"Now we are running into many problems such as property and personal safety for tourists and residents."

The key areas that need attention, according to V/Gov Smith, are law enforcement, the environment, water supply and garbage management


K. Methee agreed with V/ Gov Smith that there are major changes needed to support the tourism industry and make it more sustainable.

Political cooks spoil the soup

entral banks play an important role in every economy. By setting interest rate levels, it is their function to steer the economy's future route. Setting interest rates too low eventually results in a build up of inflationary pressures. Setting interest rates too high will at best result in slow economic growth or possibly even a recession.

The setting of interest rates is therefore an area of considerable importance to an economy. History shows us how important it is to have a competent and independent central bank, because that is what is required to keep the hands of politicians out of the decision-making process.

Much has been written about Tony Blair's legacy in the UK. From the viewpoint of economic history, the most important decision he ever made was to make the UK's central bank, the Bank of England, a completely independent institution.

It does not take a great leap back in time to realize that even with a good, market-friendly prime minister in control matters can get out of hand. Such was the case with the UK under Conservative Party administration in the 1980's.

Margaret Thatcher, Prime Minister at the time, was effectively in charge of interest rate policy decisions. In the wake of the 1987 stock market crash, she decided to reduce interest rates to encourage economic growth. It seemed to be the right decision; certainly there was a loss of confidence after the crash and logi-

entral banks play an cally anything that important role in every economy. By setting inall to the good.

In reality, although it was difficult to see it at the time, the 1987 crash was really a huge correction in an ongoing bull market. Stock markets had simply run ahead of themselves. Most stock markets reached new fresh highs 18 to 24 months after the crash.

In economic terms, Thatcher's intervention to reduce interest rates proved to be misguided. Britain by early 1990 found itself with rapidly mounting inflation that peaked at an annualized rate of 10.9%. This would have been easily avoided if interest rate decisions had been left to the Bank of England.

Thatcher was trying to make the right decisions, but this was not an area of expertise for her. She was trained in

law, not economics. Many other incumbent politicians have used interest rate setting policies to their advantage, often prior to an election.

This generally results in a reduction in interest rates some time prior to the election. As reducing interest rates results in higher economic activity, more political popularity ensues. Naturally, after the election, politicians are required to tighten interest rates once again.

Many countries have suf-

fered as a result of political interference in interest rates. Some have wisely established independent central banks as the best solution. Independent central banks may not always make the correct decisions, but at least their motives tend to be pure.

Thailand, unfortunately, has decided to move in the completely opposite direction. In an article headed "BOT gives in to the Finance Ministry" in the *Nation* on May 15, 2007, it was reported that Bank of Thailand (BoT) Gover-

nor Tarisa Watanagase had given the power to the Finance Ministry to appoint and dismiss the BoT Governor, instead of reserving this function to a central committee. This battle had continued for nine years before the BoT finally had to concede defeat.

The Finance Ministry's dubious logic concluded that the Finance Ministry is accountable to the electorate and therefore should have control of the BoT. This simply results in politicians regaining control of the central bank.

Politicians are often uncomfortable with an independent central bank. A good recent example is the newly-elected French President, Nicolas Sarkozy. For all his enthusiasm for economic reform, he continues to criticize the European Central Bank for making the euro "too

(ECB) for making the euro "too strong".

Advisers, with an appreciation that it is unseemly for a President to interfere with a central bank, are now finding that it is necessary to educate Sarkozy in economics and the functions of a central bank.

This is a perfect example of why a politician would want to interfere with a central bank. In this case, Sarkozy believes that the ECB has allowed the euro to appreciate too much in value.

Sarkozy is looking at the situation from a very narrow angle: the euro is expensive and this makes Euro Zone exports less competitive when compared with their US and Japanese counterparts. However, it is not really in the power of the ECB to alter this reality. The only way that the ECB could do this would be to reduce interest rates. This would be an entirely wrong policy measure to take, as Euro Zone economic activity is on the rise and inflation is approaching the 2% ceiling that is the benchmark for the ECB.

In approaching monetary policy from a relatively unbiased viewpoint, independent central banks have had a very successful history. In fact, an independent central bank is essential for the long-term development of any economy.

Gardening by Bloomin' Bert

Just lazily floatin' along

Aren't ponds supposed to be small? The reason I ask is that I've never quite understood the phrase "across the pond". To be honest, it would probably only make a modicum of sense to a native of the UK. We tend to use the expression to describe the section of ocean that separates us Brits from our strange neighbors several thousand miles to the west.

You've got it – South Canadia; otherwise known as the good ol' US of A. The expanse of ocean water serves an extremely useful purpose – it keeps us apart very effectively. Not that they actually realize that there is anyone else outside their borders.

Bless them. They're just so eager. Well "yeehah", I can almost hear 290 million slightly rotund people whooping and giving each other enthusiastic 'high fives' without having any reason why as they chew on their hamburgers and Twinkies. Not that I would ever dream about generalizing about an entire nation, of course.

I have to be honest; I don't know how to shake hands with many Americans. It gets a bit confusing. They start off with this multiple finger-pulling/clicking maneuver, then they hit each others' fists, first front then top to bottom, and follow it up with a strange forearm-bashing, tribal kind of thing. The latter move seems to be optional.

I'm sure I've missed a few of the procedures, but that's my point; I never really know what I'm supposed to do. Our South Canadian neighbors just don't seem to understand that those of the British persuasion simply aren't very good at this kind of thing. We'd far rather just, well, shake hands. It's a lot easier, and what chaps do, after all.

One American trait that I admire is the quest to make life as easy as they can for themselves. And why not? In fact, I'm all for it. Why not spend your life doing as little work as possible if you can? It sounds like a solid plan to me, and I try to live by that doctrine daily.

I like to think that I am able to get out of the car to visit an ATM, or twist that pesky can opener by hand using good, old-fashioned wrist action, but if I had any real degree of motivation I'd be sprinting off to the gym every morning for a quick swim and a workout. I've lost count of the number of times I've promised myself in the evening that's exactly what I would do the following morning, but somehow it just never seems to work out.

There's always a somewhat plausible subconscious excuse; "I've got a monstrous hangover", "I think I feel a slight twinge in my right knee", or the all-time classic, "I really can't be bothered this morning" as I roll over and get an extra hour of

sleep rather than indulging in all the exercise nonsense.

I started this meaningless ramble thinking about ponds, believe it or not. Coincidentally, they're the ideal addition to a garden whose owner really can't be bothered. They're perfect. Do you have to water plants in a pond? Obviously not. Do you need to turn the soil or worry about insufficient drainage? You get the point.

And there are plenty of choices when it comes to what to put in ponds in this part of the world. Water lilies are a great start, especially for a decent-sized pond. In fact, larger ponds produce larger and more abundant flowers. They're not particularly difficult to get going either.

Fill a container up to two inches from the top with rich garden soil, and plant the lily upright in the center of the pot. Firm the soil around the roots leaving the crown (where the stems and roots connect) level with the soil line. Add a couple of centimeters of gravel to hold the soil in place.

Gently lower the completed planting into the pool to a depth of about 20 centimeters over the top of the pot. This depth should be increased to 30 or 40cm once the plants are established.

Lotus flowers are possibly one of the unofficial emblems of Thailand and are equally easy to grow. These things grow from tubers – those chunky sections of roots. Bear in mind that the tubers are very fragile and should be handled carefully.

Plant the tuber horizontally, and do the gravel-adding thing, in the same way as the lilies. This time, once lowered into the water, it should only be about 10 to 15 centimeters over the pot. Lotus flowers crave full sun, so make sure that they're put in a pond that's in the sunniest part of the garden.

Then there are the floating plants and oxygenating plants. These things are hardly the most difficult plants in the world to grow, but here are the step-by step instructions for anyone who's unsure:

1. Take plant out of box or plastic carrier bag; 2. Put on the surface of water; 3. Open a beer; 4. Sit down and consume beer at your leisure. Any questions?

There's no real art to them – they just kind of float around the pond. Water lettuce are perfect. In fact any plant that meanders around floating on the surface will inevitably help to keep the pond water clear and clean too. They might even provide a bit of food for the fish.

Even though the pond might to start to look a bit grubby after a while, it's not a good idea to drain the pond frequently to clean it, as this disrupts the natural ecosystem of the pond. The key to keeping a pond clean is to stock it properly with the right kinds of plants from the beginning.

Equally as important is to not overstock your pond with fish, or over-feed the ones that are there. Too many fish will result in not enough oxygen to go around, and rather murky water, as they all swim around in their own...by-products. The bottom line is that a properly-stocked pond will prevent those rather nasty algae blooms before they ever get started. Once your pond gets going, the less you do, the better.

Going "across the pond" in Phuket is a completely different experience from the Atlantic. It won't take anywhere near as long, you can do so with Heineken in hand, and you're not quite as likely to be greeted at the far side by a loud person whooping and trying to slap his palm against yours in mid-air while muttering phrases like "good jahb". Americans are a strange lot.

TAKING OFF

aptain Peter Hay has been a pilot with Hong Kong-based Cathay Pacific Airways for more than 23 years, but he plans on grounding himself permanently when he retires in September.

However, his post-career goals extend beyond simply enjoying all the numerous leisure activities that are readily available in Phuket. His desire is to start another challenging endeavor — one that will hopefully prove more rewarding than simply relaxing day in and day out.

Capt Hay recently commenced construction on a new restaurant and pub, appropriately called Skipper's, at the Royal Phuket Marina (RPM). What promises to be a harbor haven for the island yachties, Skipper's is scheduled to open in September of this year.

Local designer Steve Jordan from Concept Paradise in Phuket has been commissioned to design the interior. The vision is to blend both aviation and marine themes using soft, sweeping curves accented by delicately-positioned lighting.

To provide the right atmosphere, natural materials and soft colors will be blended throughout entire space. The venue is in-

tended to be the backdrop from which to enjoy impressive views of the luxury yachts berthed at RPM.

"I like contemporary and comfortable design concepts that are well-suited to the surrounding environment. The focus is to bring in the elements that have been of great interest to me throughout my life, including aviation and boating. Smooth, curved lines will provide the setting by replicating the interior feel of either an aircraft or a ship.

"This feeling will be complemented by features such as the design of both the windows and the columns, which will again create the mood of being aboard a vessel. The windows will reflect the portal structures commonly seen on both airplanes and boats while the columns will be constructed in a manner which will resemble the spreaders and shrouds of a ship's mast. Additionally, a rich mahogany wood will be used throughout as a subtle accent to aid in the overall ambiance of the space," Capt Hay stated.

The conceptual layout of Skipper's will comprise both a restaurant section and a pub section that are intended to compliment each other. Seamlessly intertwined, both sections will main-

tain the intimate shipboard feel while providing guests' parties with a sense of privacy.

The restaurant section will be a spacious area intended to seat about 40 people. The central focus of this space is to allow for a clear and expansive visual field directed toward the chef and his staff, so that guests can enjoy their culinary flair as they await their dishes.

The larger pub section will seat about 70 people in a variety of comfortable stools, chairs and tables, all centered around an attractive main bar. When completed, the bar will extend around the pub in a semicircular design, with seating for more than 15 in a relaxed, yet luxurious setting.

Behind the bar will be two large portal-shaped display cases housing Skipper's selection of wines. Other touches to the decor will include a large LCD television to be installed in one corner, along with sailing-related portraits and memorabilia meant to reinforce the venue's central theme: sea exploration.

Seating in both sections will be in comfortable, olive-green upholstery matched to the mahogany wood bar, tabletops and ceiling. The purpose is to create a naturally-energized yet traditional and welcoming feel.

Skyline set for October start

new apartment development, Skyline Apartments and Penthouses, sited in the Pasak area near Cherng Talay, will begin construction in October. Project owner Suda Promdaen told the *Gazette* she expects construction to be completed by early 2009.

The Skyline will be a 17-unit apartment complex with two five-story buildings featuring different configurations. Two three-bedroom penthouses and a two-bedroom apartment and will sit atop one building, while a communal recreation area with two swimming pools and sala will top the other.

"We will have mountain views from one side and ocean views for the penthouses on the other. With many projects on the island the amount of space is limited, we want to build something where you can breath in the open area. The style of the building is airy and spacious with a focus on convenience," K. Suda said.

When completed, Skyline



will have 10 two-bedroom apartments, five three-bedroom apartments and two three-bedroom penthouses. All bedrooms in all the units will have en-suite facilities and the master bedrooms in the three-bedroom units will have

large walk-in closets. The penthouses will feature large walk-ins for two of the three bedrooms and a plunge pool on their terrace.

Building A will feature a three-bedroom apartment and a fitness center on the first floor, and the second and third floors will each have two three-bedroom apartments and one two-bedroom apartments. The pent-houses will cover two floors with two bedrooms and the kitchen and living areas on the lower floor and the master bedroom. Two single-floor two-bedroom apartments will share the fourth and fifth floors with the penthouses.

Usage area for the apartments will range from 155 to 430 square meters.

An indoor car park is the bottom floor of building B and the second, third and fourth floors will each house two two-bedroom units. An 8x12 meter swimming pool, a smaller shallow pool and a large sala will sit on the roof of the building, serving as a recreation area for the complex. An elevator will also be installed in each building.

Each apartment will have

one parking space under the buildings and the penthouses will have two. Additional parking will be provided in an open area.

"Prices start at 7.1 million baht and we estimate that the penthouses will be about 15 million baht – a good value for the amount of space. The price includes air conditioning, built-in bedroom furnishings and a fully-equipped kitchen. We are working with a freelance designer, but don't yet want to announce the contractor. We have all worked together on a previous project and should have no problems as we work well together as a team," K. Suda said.
