Thepabutr loses SorPorKor land

BANGKOK: (*The Nation, Gazette*) The Supreme Court June 7 upheld an Appeals Court ruling that ordered Tossaporn Thepabutr and his associates to vacate 98 rai of land in part of the Nakkerd Hills, near the Kata Viewpoint.

The Supreme Court read its verdict on the lawsuit between the Provincial Land Reform Office (PPLRO) and Tossaporn, husband of Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) President and former Democrat Party MP Anchalee Vanich-Thepabutr.

Tossaporn claimed the land was given to him in 1989 by landlord Charan Tungku, who had owned it since 1956, before the SorPorKor land reform program came into effect in 1975 and could thus not be driven off the land.

However, the Appeals Court ruled there was no recorded legal ownership of the land by Charan, so the transfer to Tossaporn was not legitimate.

The Supreme Court upheld an Appeals Court's ruling ordering Tossaporn to vacate the land because he had no right to it.

The land had been included in the SorPorKor land reform program, intended to provide agricultural land for poor farmers to make a living.

Tossaporn, found to have shares in companies and personal wealth totaling more than 55 million baht, failed to qualify, the Appeals Court ruled.

The SorPorKor program in Phuket began in November 1994, when then-Agriculture Minister Suthep Thaugsuban ceded title deeds to 592 plots, including land near the Kata Viewpoint, Kamala and other parts of the Nakkerd Hills, to 489 farmers.

It was later found that members of 11 wealthy families in Phuket were among the recipients

The scandal, which for months was covered as front page news in the Thai daily newspaper *Thai Rath*, eventually led to the collapse of the coalition government led by Chuan Leekpai, Democrat party leader at the time.

In a brief press release after the ruling, Tossaporn wrote that he accepted the verdict and welcomed the end to what he called a "12-year nightmare".

From its inception the real target of the case was his wife, he wrote.

Noting that all criminal charges had been dropped and that the Phuket Provincial Court originally ruled that he had a valid claim to the land, he said that all Phuket people were well aware of the circumstances behind the

Of the remaining 10 cases yet to be ruled upon by the Supreme Court, the next is that of Charoen Thawornworngwong, who claims to own four plots totaling 16 rai, also in the Nakkerd Hills in Karon.

Similarly, the Phuket Appeals Court in early 2005 overturned a decision by the Phuket Provincial Court allowing K.

Mala murder suspect surrenders

CHALONG: After two months on the run wanted for the shooting murder of Karon restaurateur Mala Peng-iam, Suban Poniamsaen handed himself in to Chalong Police Station on June 5. A reward of 100,000 baht had been offered for information leading to his capture.

About 7 pm March 27, Mala, who owned Mala Seafood restaurant, was shot three times in the face and once in the chest with a .38 caliber pistol. Police also found a bullet hole in the kitchen wall from a shot that had missed its mark.

At the time of the shooting, eyewitnesses reported that Suban had calmly walked into the restaurant kitchen and shot Mala. After the shooting, Suban was seen leaving the scene in his white Toyota sedan.

Mala, 52, and Suban, 40, were distant relatives who owned neighboring restaurants on the Karon Beach road. However, they were known to argue often, including over one of them wanting to have a karaoke machine, but the other disputing that it would be too noisy.

Pol Lt Col Sirisak Wasasiri, deputy superintendent of Chalong Police Station, told the *Gazette* that Suban arrived at Chalong Police Station about 8 pm.

"Suban arrived with a relative and handed himself in to police, but he declined to say where he had been hiding. He said that he would reveal that only in court," Lt Col Sirisak said.

Suban was released after the relative posted 200,000-baht bail, he added.

A date has yet to be set for Suban to appear in court.

Gamblers top arrest figures

PHUKET: Gambling remains Phuket's top illegal pastime with 306 arrests made from May 1 to May 30, according to statistics released by Phuket Provincial

There were 108 people arrested in drug-related cases, of which 49 involved ya bah (methamphetamine): three for importing, five for selling, 26 for possession with intent to sell, 13 for possession and two for use. A total of 6,807.5 pills were seized.

Sixteen people were arrested for inhalant abuse and 22 for possession or use of cannabis, with 18.2 grams confiscated. There were seven arrests for possession of krathom (an indigenous Thai plant that acts as a mild stimulant) with 66 leaves confiscated.

Nine people were arrested for possession of "ice" (crystal methamphetamine) with 17.5 grams seized, three for possession of ya E (Ecstasy) with 36 pills seized, and another two for possession of cocaine, with 570 grams seized.

There were 88 arrests for prostitution and 109 cases of theft reported, including theft of 10 motorcycles and five cars, with arrests made in 52 of the cases.

Three murders and three attempted murders were reported during the period, with one arrest made for each. There were 19 reports of assault with 10 arrests made and one report of rape.

Twenty-three people were arrested for possession of unlicensed firearms and two people were arrested for possession or distribution of pornography.

ACID ATTACK: Mother, daughter charged in Kamala

KAMALA: A mother and daughter were charged with throwing acid on a young woman in her room on June 8. Police believe the attack was inspired by jealousy, after the pair learned the woman was having an affair with the mother's husband.

Investigation Inspector Pol Lt Col Monsak Srisuwan told the Gazette that one of the young woman's neighbors called Kamala Police about 5 pm to report people fighting at a home at Baan Hua Kuan in Kamala.

Lt Col Monsak and fellow officers arrived to find Bang-Orn Hempo, 23, rolling on the floor crying in pain from acid that had been thrown on her.

Her clothes and belongings

were strewn around the room; scorch marks on the ceramic tile floor demonstrated the caustic effect of the liquid used in the

Bang-Orn was rushed to Patong Hospital, where she was treated for severe burns to her arms and chest and minor burns to her neck and face.

She was later transferred to Vachira Phuket Hospital.

Police investigation revealed that two women were also treated for acid burns at Patong Hospital not long after the attack was reported. They were arrested later that night while riding a motorcycle in Cherng Talay.

"They are Mayuree Damsuk, 37, and Chutima Damsuk, 16, the wife and daughter of Patchavuth Damsuk, 37," Lt Col Monsak said.

"The two suspects have confessed to the charges. The motive was jealousy, as Mayuree's husband had been having a secret affair with Bang-Orn for two years.

"We have a bottle of the same acid that they used. It is much stronger than rubber acid [commonly used in such attacks]," he added.

Mayuree and Chutima were charged with causing bodily harm and trespassing on private property, Lt Col Monsak said.

"We will continue our investigation, but we must wait until Bang-Orn is feeling better before questioning her," he said.

Bang Tao fishermen gunned down

CHERNG TALAY: Two teenage fishermen from Bang Tao were gunned down while riding their motorbikes from Heroines' Monument to Cherng Talay early on June 10.

Both died from their injuries. Deputy Investigation Inspector Pol Capt Sanit Nu-Kong of Thalang Police told the Gazette, that police received a report that the men had been shot about 1:25 am.

Officers arrived at the scene, near Baan Manik, to find the two men lying on the ground near their fallen motorcycles.

"Virat Je-So,18, originally from Krabi, was dead at the scene. He had been shot once in the middle of the back, once in the left calf and once in his right hip," Capt Sanit said, adding that a .38 caliber bullet casing was found near the body.

Likit To-Pulad, 19, originally from Samui, also had been shot three times: once in the chest and twice in his right arm, Capt Sanit added. He was rushed to Thalang Hospital, where he was pronounced dead.

Capt Sanit told the Gazette that a friend of the two deceased was riding behind the pair when they were attacked.

"He told me that two motorcycles with about fours guys rode up beside them and shot his friends before speeding off toward Bang Tao.

"However, he cannot remember their faces," he added.

"We are not sure whether or not the attack was related to their work. We are investigating whether the two men had any enemies," Capt Sanit said.

"The two men had grown up in Bang Tao, and have worked as fishermen in the area for a long time."

Phuket cable car idea left dangling

PATONG: Investors hoping to build a hillside cable car as Phuket's newest tourist attraction got a lukewarm response during a June 8 meeting with Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit, who told them to come back when they have a more specific plan.

The would-be investors were Malaysian Rodin "VJ" Adihilmi of Mesira Investment and his Thai partner Pornlert Wongsirin, Managing Director of Affluent Thai Co Ltd.

The pair and their associates met with the governor at the Phuket Provincial Operations Center at Phuket Provincial Hall on June 8.

Explaining that he did not want to do anything that would be opposed by the provincial government, Mr Adi-hilmi told the governor that he and his associates only wanted to present the project concept and request a letter outlining the legal and bureaucratic steps they would need to take in order to proceed.

"The entire construction budget would come from private sector investment; we would not ask the province for any funding. We think Patong is the suitable site for such a project, though we still have to study the issue further," he said.

Gov Niran seemed unimpressed, noting that the investors' scheme lacked such basic details as where in Patong the project would be sited. He also noted that,

unlike the more autonomous Malaysian states, permission for such a project in Thailand could only come from central government authorities in Bangkok.

The would-be investors were told that if they wanted to proceed they should study the topography and determine possible sites, then consider land rights issues and the effect such a project would have on both the environment and local residents.

"The last step would be to hold a series of public hearings," he said.

Reminding the investors that local building codes prohibit buildings above 23 meters and forbid the construction of any permanent

structures above 80 meters, Gov Niran advised them to be especially careful in determining whether the land they need to build upon was controlled by the government or privately held.

"I'm really worried about local reaction. Even if your project is good, there will be big problems if it is opposed by local people," said Gov Niran, who suggested that they hire a consultant and return with a more detailed presentation.

The two investors, who have no previous experience in cable car projects, agreed to follow Gov Niran's advice and said they would return at a future date.

Patong 'beach boy' charged with rape

PATONG (*Kom Chad Luek*): Police have charged a parasail boat employee at Patong Beach for the rape of a Japanese tourist.

The rape was reported to Pol Capt Padungpong Dooksook-kaew at Kathu Police Station at 1 am on June 6.

The victim, a 24-year-old woman, told police that while she was sunbathing at Patong Beach, she met a parasail boat employee who agreed to take her night-clubbing in Phuket City.

Later, after he picked her up on his motorbike, the man said he had forgotten something at home. When they reached his room, in a house for parasail staff on 50 Pi Rd, he forced himself on her, police said.

After he let her go, the woman hired a motorbike taxi and reported the crime to the police. She was taken to Patong Hospi-

tal, where doctors confirmed she had been raped.

The rapist was identified as Somchai Thongyoo, 30, from Ao Luk District in Krabi.

Arrested at his home by a team of Kathu Police led by Pol Maj Serm Kwannimit, Somchai initially denied all charges.

He confessed only after the victim picked him out of a police line-up, police said.

In his confession, Somchai said that he was attracted to the victim.

Given that she had agreed to go out with him in Phuket City, he thought the feeling was mutual

However, after she resisted his advances he decided to rape her as he thought that she would not report it to the police.

Somchai was charged with raping a woman who is not his wife.

Fresh market vendors to relocate to new site

PHUKET CITY: Vendors at the fresh market on Ranong Rd, in the heart of Phuket City, will relocate to a temporary market set up for them on Wirat Hongyok Rd from June 17.

The temporary market, opposite Suan Luang Park, has been set up by Phuket City Municipality to minimize inconvenience for shoppers while the municipality builds new market buildings at Ranong Rd, one of the oldest market sites in Phuket.

The Downtown Market, built on private land adjoining Ranong Rd and popular with afternoon shoppers, will be unaffected by the move.

Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwannasuppana said that the new market has 475 stalls – enough for every vendor from the Ranong Rd market to relocate.

Vendors who relocate from Ranong Rd will not be charged site fees at the new market.

The new market comprises a total area of 15,470 square meters, including: 27 one-story shophouses offering a total of 864sqm; 4,695sqm set aside for goods stalls; 9,816sqm dedicated to traffic and parking, and 96sqm set aside for restrooms.

Construction started in November last year, with a budget of 14.27 million baht.

"The temporary market will be convenient for people; it is very comfortable, clean and has enough area for parking," K. Somjai said.

The public is invited to join the opening merit-making ceremony for the market on June 17, when food offerings will be given to Buddhist monks from 5:30 am.

Karaoke hostess murdered in Soi Pink Lady

PHUKET CITY: A karaoke bar hostess was found murdered in her apartment off Montri Rd early June 6. Police are searching for the victim's live-in boyfriend, who is the prime suspect in the case.

Phuket City Police Duty Inspector Pol Lt Col Sien Kaewthong identified the victim as 28year-old Kanchana Aonpleng, from Pathum Thani province.

About 12:45 an June 6, police received a report that K. Kanchana's body was found on her bed at an unnamed boarding house on Soi Pink Lady.

K. Kanchana appeared to have been hit on the head with a heavy object. Police estimate that she died five to seven hours before her body was discovered. Her body was taken to Vachira Phuket Hospital for examination.

Neighbors said the victim had lived in the room since April with a man identified as Saharat Kamhongsa, 27, from Khon Kaen province, Col Sien said.

Saharat was a security guard, and K. Kanchana was a hostess at Nongwan Karaoke Bar, north of Nimit Circle.

K. Kanchana's body was discovered after relatives of Saharat called KPS to say that Saharat had called them about 6 pm on June 5. Sarahat reportedly said that he had just killed someone and was going into hiding.

Col Sien told the *Gazette* that neighbors had heard people

arguing in the victim's room days before the murder.

Police in Khon Kaen have been notified so they can arrest Saharat if he tries to return to his family there, he added.

Police suspect jealousy as the motive for the murder.

Chalong marina and

With competing plans, untested ideas and the nearby residents up in arms against it, the Chalong Marina project met fierce opposition at the latest town hall discussion June 5. Chalong resident Marque A. Rome investigates aspects of the project's proposed second phase.

Tension had been building locally for months, but being a butt for jeers and sarcasm must still have come as a shock to Marine Transport Department Technical and Planning Director Vilawan Siringampen. She and her team of bespectacled engineers from Bangkok had come to Muang Phuket School in Rawai the afternoon of June 5 to "exchange views" on Phase II of her department's Chalong Marina project.

After more than five hours of long-winded explanation and back-peddling by the consulting engineers – whose problems were compounded by inept microphone technique – the local people, NGO representatives and elected officials in attendance were clearly out of patience.

The most animated were sunburnt, long-tail boatmen: "Speak southern dialect if you must speak, but get it over with!" said one from the back of the room whose comments elicited cheers.

"I'm here to offer my opinion on this project and you professors will please stay put – we need no more of your explanations," said an elected tambon official. His gibe was greeted by wild applause. In fact, applause was wholly for speakers who derided the project, now well into Phase I of construction.

So, Planning Director Vilawan, better-spoken than her subordinates, briefly emphasized the Transport Ministry's desire to meet the people's needs; noted that the project as outlined during the meeting had been honestly arrived at and was a good one, considering both budgetary and environmental constraints.

She left the podium – appearing perplexed amid the hubbub. Few heeded her remarks; all were talking among themselves.

Also caught in the middle was Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) President Anchalee Wanich Thepabutr, the island's highest elected official. The *OrBorJor* has signed on to finance part of the proposed marina's infrastructure and will manage the completed project. She is, in effect, the project's final arbiter. Just before the meeting's end, K. Anchalee addressed her anxious constituents.

University of California at Los Angeles-educated, K. Anchalee was for eight years Phuket's sole MP. As a senior member of the Democrat Party, she was awarded one of the coveted "party-list" seats in the 2000 election and served on the party's Management Committee. She is regarded by many as the island's most powerful political figure.

With the Democrats in a

strong position to lead the next government, and with a Cabinet post perhaps at hand – K. Anchalee can have no interest in projects that cause dissension or cast her *OrBorJor* administration in the role of oppressor.

"Nothing is being pushed on anyone. We're here to exchange views. This is a democratic system we live in," she said in her peculiarly refined brand of southern dialect. "We have the right to [tell the government] what we think"

The substance of what the roughly 130 persons in attendance thought was that the project is wrong: too small and ill-laid out for a proper yacht marina; damaging to the environment; and providing nothing for small operators, save additional hassle and expense.

In a nutshell, the Marine Transport Department and its consulting firms want to construct around the southern half of Chalong pier a 210-slip yacht harbor: 66 slips for boats up to 12 meters; 82 for boats up to 16m; 36 for vessels up to 20m; 19 for those up to 30m; and seven for those up to 50m.

Phase 1, costing 70 million baht and slated for completion September 30 after 340 days of construction, involves making only 44 slips (30 x 12m; 8 x 16m; 4 x 20m; 1 x 30m; 1 x 50m).

It also involves installation of most infrastructure: dredging a boat basin; marker towers to aid navigation; freshwater tanks; plumbing; electricity (the slips will have power outlets for re-charging batteries, etc); a fueling and water station; and a single-story maintenance building. There is also a new onshore, underground sewage treatment facility that empties into the klong running behind the bars and beachside restaurants before discharging into the still, shallow seawater near Kan Eng 2 restaurant.

During Phase 2, budgeted at 300 million baht, a multi-pur-

pose building on the pier to house administration, immigration and customs services will be built; the boat basin expanded and a boat channel dredged; and 166 slips added. Plumbing and electricity will be appropriately enhanced—and two breakwaters, "made of large boulders, easily and cheaply sourced in Phuket" put on the south and southeast sides of the pier.

The riprap would have a combined length of 1,300 meters and the whole project would cover more than half a square kilometer.

Budget for the fueling station and water tanks comes from the *OrBorJor;* the remainder from the Ministry of Transport. Two variations on the basic plan were offered at the June 5 meeting. All looked pretty good on paper.

Best of all, the project would generate a 24% "economic return" and pay for itself within five years. "It's certainly some-



thing the government should undertake," the consultants wrote.

The project was initiated in 2004, when the Marine Transport Department signed contracts with three companies – Golden Plan, Sea Spectrum and STS Engineering and Consultants – to engineer marinas in four places: two in the Gulf of Thailand and two on the Andaman coast.

The companies were also charged with surveying the likeliest spots for construction. Unfortunately, in the Marine Transport report the three firms are referred to as an undifferentiated unit, so it is impossible to say who does what.

A key word is "marina", that is, a port for pleasure craft. Chalong Bay, it must be recalled, is a port not only for yachts, but

also for small craft of various types: commercial fishing boats; long-tail boats that transport cargo and passengers to off-shore islands, and island-shuttle speedboats. The marina envisioned offers little to owners of such vessels. Indeed it was engineered, according to the consulting report, solely for pleasure craft.

But according to Tambon Rawai Moo 3 (Koh Lone Island) administrative organization (*OrBorTor*) member Siwakorn "Ibrahim" Chaipakdee, such craft are clearly a minority of those using the bay at any given time.

The majority numbers roughly 100 long-tails; 80 locally-owned fishing and diving boats; 50 foreign-owned dive and tour boats; and 200 speedboats.

In his opinion, while the op-

erators of all the boats might welcome appropriate port facilities only the large foreign-owned dive boats would benefit from the proposed marina.

As it happens, the dive boat owners themselves see little in the plan. Even yachtsmen who moor in Chalong Bay are not keen on it.

So how was the plan arrived at? Not by talking with those who use the bay. Instead, the consultants' report cites surveys, studies and mathematical models – the latter of prime importance – as the basis. Some information may have been flawed: dubious assertions are presented as fact.

For example: "In terms of natural beauty, and the quality of its unspoiled environment, number one in popularity on the Gulf of Thailand is Pattaya," it notes,

"followed by Koh Samui [and adjacent islands] and Koh Chang in Trat province...."

The consultants also insist that murky Chalong Bay – with its bottom of richly varied gunk, its several prawn farms and hundreds of boats – is virtually unpolluted. The report is notably silent regarding how statistical gathering was carried out.

It was determined, however, that, as far as marine-borne tourism is concerned, "environmental considerations outweigh anything on the engineering side in choosing a site for the project."

Indeed, muddled attempts to protect the environment handicapped every phase of the engineering, as the consultants readily admitted during the June 5 meeting. Another consideration was

that the marina "must not compete with private sector-owned facilities".

On the important question of how the project would effect water flow in the bay – and the resulting impact on the environment – the report is vague. It references mathematical modeling at various scales, including the smallest at 50m x 50m covering the project site, but goes on to compare modeling results against actual measurements at a site in Krabi – not Chalong. From the report, there is no way to discern which of the three consultants carried out the modeling, nor how it was actually conducted.

Although many aspects of the project have been criticized by locals, the part that evokes Continued on page 6

Chalong marina meets wet welcome from locals

perhaps the greatest contempt is the siting of the southern break-

"Our studies show that Chalong Bay's protection from wind and waves is more or less perfect," the consultants wrote. "In considering wave action over the last 50 years, we see that it is necessary only to construct breakwaters at the south and southeast." To minimize environmental impact on the bay, which flushes to the south, the boat channel between the breakwaters is angled so that currents will be diverted as little as possible.

"Analysis shows that the breakwaters' impact on currents will be quite small, hardly different from having no breakwater," wrote the consultants. In this, their opponents agree. "It doesn't happen much, but it happens every year that a strong swell comes from the south," said OrBorTor Rawai's Siwakorn, who has three fishing boats in the bay.

"If your boat is tied up at a mooring there's no harm done the boat turns on its mooring with nothing to beat against. But for boats berthed in slips, the case is different: they need protection from the swells – otherwise they'll bang against the floating docks and be damaged; and some of these yachts cost millions of dollars. But the southern breakwater's siting allows waves to enter the marina, which is bound to cause damage."

Seafarer Divers owner Guy "Charlie" Lidureau, who has led the foreign community's opposition to the proposal, was more specific: "In winter, there are two-meter swells; this channel opens to the south – which is where the waves come from!" he observed witheringly. Lidureau insists, based on 28

years' experience operating out of Chalong Bay, that the southern breakwater is worse than useless: that it will funnel waves onto the beach, destroying embankments south of the pier. He also notes the proposed marina is far too small – it should have 800 - 1,200 berths "because 300 to 400 boats are already using the bay" and many operators would like berths.

"All hotels would be interested in a good marina," he asserted, noting how current shortcomings at the pier cause tie-ups that play havoc with scheduling. He drew up a plan proposing breakwaters be paved over, connected to the shore, and broad enough for cars to park.

As those who use it know, the current pier area is heavily congested. There is insufficient parking and only one narrow access road. It has no speedboat ramps, and landings low enough for speedboats and long-tails to use are fixed, instead of reacting with the tide: they are thus largely useless, and in fact dangerous, as the lower stairs are covered with slimy, slippery weeds from constant immersion in seawater.

A particular sore point is the existing filling station: Lidureau's 22-meter, 60-ton dive boat, Andaman Seafarer takes more than three hours to load a full 3,800-liter tank of fuel and its 7,000-liter water tank takes four to six hours to load, according to Lidureau. Long queues are the norm, moreover, because the filling station pier is too small.


To rectify these and other shortcomings, Lidureau drew up a plan of his own, resiting the channel entrance to the north and staggering the breakwaters to ensure quiet seas in the marina. The plan, which he passed round to some 80 persons both in government and in the private sector, engaged discussion and galvanized opposition by the latter. An informal meeting he arranged June 4 was attended by 22 senior provincial officials and tour boat operators.


"If I am made marketing manager of the Thai Dive Association, as I expect, we shall be even more active," he said.

But reaction was so hostile during the June 5 meeting from local Thais – that is, from voters - the marina may be stillborn in whatever shape: "It seems the information we've heard [from the consultants] was unreliable," said OrBorJor president K. Anchalee.

She suggested that re-drawing the plans may be necessary and would require a new budget. That, of course, will depend on a new government.

So the project completion date of Phase II is anybody's guess. In the meantime, one can only wonder how the 44 berths and attendant facilities of the 70million-baht Phase I will fare without a breakwater.





Thai working hours 'too long'

hailand has been ranked third in a global list of countries where people work excessively long hours.

In a new study by the International Labor Organization (ILO), Thailand was shown to have 46.7% of people working more than 48 hours per week.

The figure includes 33% of all salaried employees. Thailand ranked below only the Republic of Korea and Peru on the list.

Thais working in the manufacturing sector were found to be working 59 hours per week, more than in any other country.

In the service sector, many employees are also working 50 hours or more per week, including: transport, storage and communication (50 hours a week); real estate and business (50.7); financial services (52.9); and health and social work (53.4).

Informal employment is another major source of longer working hours. Nearly 57% of all self-employed workers in Thailand are working more than 50 hours. Very few self-employed people, only about one in eight, work less than 35 hours.

In addition, the minimum legal entitlement for annual holidays in Thailand is also among the lowest in Asia.

Shorter working hours, the report says, can have positive consequences, including benefits to workers' health and family lives, reduced accidents in the workplace, greater productivity and equality between the sexes.

Blackmailing Brit: The hunt by Thai police and Scotland Yard for a blackmailer who threatened to poison food at a Tesco-Lotus store if he was not given UK£ 2 million (137 million baht) ended with the arrest of Briton Alexander John Winstone, 36.

Married to a Thai woman, Winstone said he simply wanted to settle down in Thailand and open an Internet caf£.

Tesco would have had no

problem paying the money because it was a very profitable business, he said after his arrest.

Winstone was nabbed on June 7 just as he walked out of an Internet caf£ in Bangkok after sending his seventh blackmail email to a top Tesco executive.

He confessed to the crime, expressed remorse and said that he never intended to harm anyone

Winstone has been charged with blackmail and faces up to five years in jail if convicted.

Twisted yank: An American tour guide and restaurant owner was jailed for 50 years after being found guilty of serially molesting his own daughter.

The South Central Criminal Court convicted Joshua Napp, 34, of regularly molesting his 12year-old daughter. The girl's mother filed a police report after she learned of the events.

The court heard that the man had forced his daughter to

stimulate him and perform oral sex on several occasions between July 2 and July 15 last year.

The mother told the court the offenses occurred following their separation and her employment at a casino in Cambodia, when the daughter went to stay with Napp at his Bangkok home.

Real merit: Bangkok taxi driver Suthep Kasak, 41, returned three cashier's checks worth a combined 140 million baht that three Japanese businessmen had left behind in his cab, saying he never wanted to take a "short cut" to riches.

K. Suthep, who heard about the missing checks on the Sor Wor Por 91 traffic radio station, returned them to their owners the same day.

The Japanese thanked Suthep for his honesty and rewarded him with 3,000 baht in cash before the group went on to Suvarnabhumi Airport to catch a flight back to Japan.

Suthep said he was excited to have something as valuable as the checks in his hands, although it was later explained to him that only the named beneficiaries could have cashed them.

He urged other taxi drivers to do good deeds and avoid temptation and greed.

Desperate measure: Laddarat Thummalee, a 23-year-old from Surin Province, confessed to theft charges after stealing more than 65,000 baht worth of alternative health foods, sold by a company she worked for, in the hope they could cure her breast cancer.

After her confession she pleaded for sympathy and also for donations to repay a huge debt her parents had incurred in order to get money for her treatment.

Case investigator Pol Maj Sanchai Phisaiphan said he sympathized with Laddarat, but had no choice but to proceed with the case as demanded by the firm.

He said he had suggested to Laddarat that she prepare all the documents proving she had breast cancer to show to the court in the coming trial so she could ask for leniency.

"I took the products because the labels said they could cure cancer," said K. Laddarat, who was diagnosed with breast cancer early this year.

Content curfew: The Cabinet has banned TV programs with content considered "suitable only for adult viewers" from going on air before 10 pm.

TV programs rated as having content appropriate for children aged between 13 and 18 years old, but with parental guidance required, may be broadcast only after 8 pm.


"The Cabinet has agreed to the plan because it is aware that the medium has influence over learning and development," said interim Culture Minister Khunying Khaisri Sriaroon.

She said that a survey had found that 98% of children spent most of their free time watching TV. On weekdays they spent an average of 3.9 hours a day, with the figure increasing to 5.5 hours a day on weekends.

Deputy Prime Minister Paiboon Wattanasiritham said TV stations began rating their programs in December.

TV stations are expected to take a few months to fully respond to the plan, he said.

Man kills father, eats heart

man in Nakhon Sri Thammarat's Phibun District killed his father and ate his heart on June 2, bringing back memories of Thailand's Hannibal Lector, the infamous 1950s serial killer See-Ouy.

When police, alerted by the killer's wife, arrived at the scene they found Athit Riyaphan, 46, standing, knife in hand, over the body of his father Khlong Riyaphan, 74.

Athit's mouth was red with blood and he was clutching some of his father's organs in his hands, police reported. On confrontation by police, Athit put down the 10-inch kitchen knife and did not resist arrest.

On examination of K. Khlong's body, police found he had been stabbed and disemboweled. His heart was completely missing, presumed eaten, and most of his lungs and liver were also gone.

Athit's wife, Arisa Riyaphan, 40, told police that her husband, a building contractor, had invited his father round for dinner

"When his father arrived [Khlong] chased me out of the house and tried to attack me.

"I then heard him shouting unintelligibly at his father. I ran to find someone to take me to the police station to get help. When I got back to the house I saw what had happened," she said.

The officer in charge of the case, Lt Col Phongthak Muatmuang from Phibun District Police, said that Athit had vomited all over the police car and detention cell and on questioning replied in a confused manner.

Athit's son, who was present at the beginning of the attack, told police that his father had first throttled K. Khlong be-

fore using a pillow to suffocate him. Police therefore believe K. Khlong was already dead when he was disemboweled, Col Phongthak added.

Athit's relatives told police that Athit had previously been treated for at Surat Thani's Suansaranrom Psychiatric Hospital and was on medication for a mental condition.

Athit is being detained at Phibun District Police Station awaiting a psychiatric evaluation, Col Phogthak added.

Suspicious suicide? A young man under investigation for theft charges was found dead in his cell in Thung Yai District Police Station in Nakhon Sri Thammarat on June 3.

Police reported that the man, Chainarong Khamnuan, 20,

hung himself from the bars of his cell with his shirt. Relatives of the man, however, were not convinced by the police reports and suggested that Chainarong may have died at the hands of police

officers.

Lt Col Nitithon Tanseriskul,
Deputy Superintendent of Thung
Yai District Police Station, said
that he was aware that Chainarong's relatives were not convinced by the police explanation
of Chainarong's death. He would
be happy to arrange an independent post mortem exam, he said.

Pirates of the Straights: Achenese pirates released two Thai fishing boat captains June 2 after receiving a ransom of 1.2 million baht from the boat's Malaysian owner. The two had been taken hostage when pirates raided their boat on May 19.

On June 3, Lt Col Woraaek Naetiniyom, an Inspector with Satun Marine Police, went to collect the two men, Seri Rotcharoen, 46, and Bunphen Khongkaeow, 33, Thais living in Perlis state in Malaysia.

K. Seri said that he and K. Bunphen were off Koh Paesue, near the Thai-Malaysian border, when pirates boarded their boat. The pirates released the 35 crew members but took him and K. Bunphen hostage before stealing the boat, K. Seri added.

The two were then taken into a forest and held prisoner while the pirates negotiated with the boat owner.

"On June 2 the boat's owner, Ko Song, transferred 1.2 million baht from a bank account in Penang to a bank account in Indonesia. The pirates then took us back to Perlis and the boat owner notified the Marine Police in Satun to come and get us," K. Seri said.

Jatukham fever: Thieves broke into a temple in Nakhon Sri Thammarat City June 4 and stole Jatukham Ramathep and other amulets valued about three million baht.

The theft was reported to Lt Col Aphichat Kotchawet, Investigating Inspector at Nakhon Sri Thammarat Muang District Police, at 8:30 that morning.

The thieves climbed through the air vent of the bathroom in the cell of Phra Anuchit Taechapunyo, Abbot of Wat Samamuang. They then levered open a wooden chest containing the talismans.

Phra Anuchit told police that the thieves had taken more than 100 Jatukham Ramathep amulets worth 400,000-500,000 baht and a selection of other holy amulets, a total haul of around three million baht, he estimated.

The previous morning he had seen a youth wandering round the temple but had thought nothing of it. He discovered the crime when he got back from his morning alms round, the Abbot added.

Police said that they believe the criminals probably had some inside knowledge of the temple as they knew where the amulets were kept and took only valuable

The theft comes amid a surge in crimes related to Jatukham Ramathep amulets, which has been dubbed "Jatukham Fever" in the Thai-language press.

Dangerous day: Twelve people were injured when a powerful bomb went off near a teashop in central Yala June 8. A village official was shot dead and four people injured in militant attacks the same day elsewhere in the troubled Deep South.

Police said the bomb, hidden in a telephone booth near the shop, had probably been set off remotely. A resident of the area heard the blast from a kilometer away.

The victims, many of whom suffered serious injuries, were taken to Yala Regional Hospital. Police blocked off the scene as crowds gathered to look at the damage.

In Narathiwat, militants shot dead Hami Wani, 45-year-old deputy head of the remote village of Baan Salo, about 1 pm as he was driving home from Rangae District with two assistants. The assistants, Hamu Jehvo and Muhamad Nikaji, were injured.

A roadside bomb in the province's Muang District injured two marines on patrol with four colleagues to guard teachers on their way to school.

Two wooden buildings of Baan Pohming school in Pattani's Panare District were burned to the ground about 4 am. A school building in Yala's Krong Pinang District was also set on fire around the same time.

Police suspect the arsonists in Panare are the same that set fire to schools and public-health centers in neighboring Sai Buri district days earlier.

Bright Coff lights,

eading west and waiting for the traffic light at the Tesco-Lotus in tersection, you can't miss it: a big eye blinks at you in a rainbow of colors. Get too mesmerized and horns will honk when you miss the green light.

Animation and bright colors have come to Phuket's signs with the introduction of LED (lightemitting diodes) to the local advertising world. And the first shop to have it, naturally, is the sign maker's.

Woraya Buaprom, branch manager of Anima Sign Thailand Co Ltd, told the *Gazette*, "We are the only company in Thailand making animated LED signs. We bought a copyright from America and export signs to Korea. We have shops in Bangkok, Pattaya and Phuket. The other companies here that want to sell animated LED signs order them from us."

The lights come in six colors, K. Woraya says, but by mixing them they can create any color a customer might want.

"We chose to open a shop in Phuket because LED signs are well-known to foreigners and many foreigners have businesses here, so we should do well. Thais are quite familiar with neon signs, but neon lights are very limited in how they can be animated.

"LED signs cost more than neon signs but have many advantages. Compared to neon, LED lights last a lot longer, up to 10 years or more, and also use significantly less electricity. LED signs use only 12 volts so they are much safer than neon, which uses 1,500 volts. We also have water-resistant systems for outdoors," she adds.

The cost of an LED sign depends on how many LEDs are used, the complexity of the animation program, design, size, and how far away you want the sign to be seen (how powerful the lights need to be).

Animated signs as small as seven centimeters can be produced by the shop, but if you want your sign to be seen up to a kilometer away, they can also make a four-meter high sign for you. The shop can also design fullcolor screens, similar to a huge TV screen, but it is produced in America, resulting in a two week turn-around time.

Early bookings hint at Seoul revival

y most standards the most recent high sea son was a good one for the tourist industry in Krabi. This was a relief for those who suffered through the tsunami and a couple of lackluster years.

The 2007-2008 season, at this early stage, promises to be another strong one.

Barring any major disasters, man-made or otherwise, the number of tourists should continue to expand in number and in countries of origin.

The Department of Civil Aviation, which operates Krabi International Airport, recently released statistics for April 2006 showing a 72.6% increase in the number of passengers from April

Talking to tour agents and hoteliers, the common theme is "not enough rooms". What a change from 2005! The talk about town is also that the number of direct flights from international destinations will expand from three – currently Singapore, Stockholm and Oslo fly direct -

The additional seven cities are rumored to include Seoul, Taipei, Hong Kong and Frankfurt. As no contract details have been released, no confirmation can yet be made, however.

However a "Welcome to Krabi" sign in Korean and some Koreans recently looking for real estate might lend credence to Seoul as a new source of customers.

The opening of the 276room Sofitel in Klong Muang and the palatial Krabi Success Resort, along with expansions at several existing properties, are helping to solve the possible room shortage.

A number of villa projects are on line or just completed to help satiate the demand for larger family-type accommodations required by many visitors from northern Europe.

A lot can happen between June and the beginning of high season in November, but it is clear




RUDE AWAKENING? Sleepy Koh Sriboya, with its newly-installed underground power supply, is poised for development.

that the demand for rooms is strong, even at this early stage. So lets hope for clear sailing until next high season.

Power to the islands: Since the announcement of the installation of underground power lines that will supply electricity to Koh Sriboya, Koh Jum and Koh Phi Phi, there has been an increase in investor interest in some of the lesser-developed areas.

Koh Sriboya and Koh Jum have been sleepy islands with little habitation outside of sea gypsy villages and fishing com-

A recent tour of the islands confirms that interest has been



piqued there, but to the outsider it still looks very much like an untouched, prisitne paradise.

In fact, one senior government official from Phuket remarked, "There's nothing like this left in Phuket."

The west coast of Koh Jum is seeing some low-density bungalow colonies and small resorts under construction.

There is also the occasional villa protruding from a hillside, some with fabulous sea views and backdrops of the islands and karsts the area is famous for.

Otherwise the area seems mostly untouched, with no tourists in sight.

There are rumors, however, that some of the bigger hotel groups have started to look at the area, so what will we find five years from now? Hard to predict, but my guess is it won't be an undeveloped paradise for long.

We received an email from some concerned residents on Railey Beach saying that the coral in front of Tonsai Beach had been dynamited, supposedly to make the beach accessible to boats at low tide.

Inquiries were made to many locals in the area, but no one seems to have any concrete information – or maybe they just weren't talking.





He turned to me, as innocent as an angel, and said, "You are the most gorgeous woman in the world."


The wonder of the feeling went on for so long that it might almost have been happiness. It even survived the quite disproportionately loud and sustained laughter of his teenage brother.

ove it or hate it, most people would argue that Patong's Soi Bangla is one of the more interesting places to take a late-night stroll in Phuket.

Suit-hawking touts of dubious immigration status, package tourists pushing baby strollers, ladyboys so spectacularly festooned that a peacock would cringe at the sight: it's all just part of the spectacle of mass humanity on display there every evening.

In such a chaotic visual milieu, one could easily fail to notice a white ambulance marked with Chinese characters parked nightly near the top of the soi – and the bespectacled European man standing at the ready by its side.

That man is Swedish volunteer rescue worker Lars G Dikander, 58, who risks his life three nights a week with the Kusoldharm Volunteer Rescue Foundation, which maintains 10 rescue pickups and three ambulances on the island.

With 25 paid workers and 50 volunteers, Kusoldharm is by far Phuket's largest rescue organization. Equipped with police radios, its workers often arrive at gory accident and crimes scenes before even the police can get there – and are often greeted by horrific scenes of death and dying.

So how does a Swede reaching retirement age end up on a Phuket ambulance crew, responding to some of the island's worst accidents?

After nine months working with the Kusoldharm
Rescue Foundation in Phuket as a volunteer,
photographer Lars G Dikander has become a fixture
at many accident scenes across the island, helping
the injured and taking pictures when he can.
A man of a varied background, including welder, taxi
driver and trained hospital orderly, he seems to be an
enigma that fits in perfectly with Phuket.

Ulf Peder Johansson asks Lars what keeps him on
the roads, helping accident victims time and again.

Lars came to Thailand for the first time in early January, 2005, as part of a Swedish tsunami rescue team organized by a Swedish branch of the Lion's Club. He first visited Railey Beach in Krabi, where he helped a relative, married to a Thai, who was living there.

After that, he began to divide his time between Sweden and Thailand, taking part in post-tsunami reconstruction efforts in hard-hit areas including Khao Lak, Kamala and Patong.

Given his varied background, it is no surprise Lars volunteered to help out. Born in 1949 in the city of Borlange in central Sweden, Lars' life history includes stints as a factory worker, welder, hotel worker and taxi driver – to name just a few of the jobs he has done.

He has lived and worked in many different parts of Sweden, where he still has two children: Alexander, born in 1987, and Jennifer, born three years later. His mother died in Sweden last year and his father just this year.

"I hope my kids can come and visit soon. I miss them," he told the *Gazette*.

It was in 1979 that Lars first began to work as a freelance photographer, a job he continues to do for a wide variety of news agencies, including some of Sweden's largest daily newspapers, such as *Expressen* and *Aftonbladet*.

Although many of Lars' pictures these days are taken at crime and accident scenes and are too graphic for most Englishlanguage media, they have been commonly featured in the Thai media, including numerous accident-scene photos that have appeared on the front page of *Siang Tai*, Phuket's Thai-language daily newspaper.

Most of the photographs he sells these days involve Swedes and are sold to Swedish newspapers, he said.

Lars began his medical training at about the same time as he began snapping pictures. In the early '80s he worked as a hospital orderly. Interested in the work, he studied to become a nurse and before long found himself helping doctors treat patients in the Intensive Care Unit of Gavle-Sandvikens Hospital, in the Swedish city of Gavle.

That experience and training continues to help him to this day in his work with the Kusoldharm Foundation.

It was while living in the large Swedish cities of Stockholm and Malmo that he began contributing many photos to the big Swedish newspapers: fights, fires, car accidents, burglaries – Lars has

just about seen it all during his know... all the ones that were many years behind the lens.

When asked what was the worst accident scene he had ever encountered, he said: "Road accident scenes can be very bad. About four months ago, a Swede got crushed by a 10-wheel truck after falling off his motorbike in Kata. That was a very bad scene. Shootings and stabbings are often very gory too," he said.

When asked what has been his all-time favorite photo, he replied with a laugh, "I don't

published."

After he started visiting Thailand regularly he met his future wife Somniang Pengthong, an office worker at Siang Tai at the time. After two years of courtship, the couple were married in March this year.

"She is the best wife. We married out of love, nothing else. Sometimes we have a bit of a language barrier, but we are working on it," he said.

Asked why he goes on res-

cue missions three nights a week with no remuneration, Lars said, "The danger has become a part of my everyday existence. We have an expression in Swedish that goes 'My heart pumps to help others," said Lars, adding that he likes the excitement of rescue work.

"The sound of sirens is like the soundtrack of my life."

During the nine months that Lars has been with the Kusoldharm Foundation, many of the calls he has responded to have involved road accidents involving drunk drivers. Those who survive are seldom model patients, he has observed.

"Many people who are in accidents are drunk, confused or in shock. Sometimes they try to rip off the oxygen mask or pull out the intravenous feeds we use to treat them on the way to hospital," he said.

Though he tries to talk to them and calm them down, it doesn't always work: some patients need to be restrained to prevent them from hurting themselves – or others.

At crime scenes, Lars is sometimes called upon to help police. He once had a finger broken when, at a police officer's request, he assisted in trying to drag a violently drunk man into a cell at a police station. Lars said he had to punch the man to get him to let go of the finger.

What is alleged to have been a drunk driving accident also cost the life of a friend and fellow Kusoldharm worker Apirak Suemuang, 24, who was one of two killed when a Kusoldharm truck rushing four accident victims to hospital and a Toyota sedan collided at high speed at the Tesco intersection on May 6.

Despite the dangers, Lars said he feels comfortable and satisfied with the work he is doing and has integrated with Thailand and the Thai way of doing things.

He has great respect for the Thai Royal Family, he said, adding with pride that he was the only photographer from Phuket invited to take pictures at HM The King's Diamond Jubilee celebrations in Bangkok last year.

Asked how he can afford to do so much volunteer work, Lars said he was lucky to get a medical pension from the Swedish government about eight years ago that allows him to live here comfortably – if everything goes according to plan, that is.

Lars explained that Phuket is now his permanent home, following a series of events that began with a burglary of his rented house in Chalong. That robbery, which left him without any valuables or cash, meant he could not afford to fly back to Sweden or pay the rent on his apartment there.

Eventually, all of the possession he had stored there - furniture, old photos, almost everything he owns – were removed. He has not seen them since.

When not working as an emergency rescue volunteer, Lars enjoys music – and not just as a consumer. He can play several instruments, including the guitar, accordion, harmonica and drums. Back in Sweden, his love for music dovetailed well with his photography skills and he often photographed Swedish bands.

Asked how he deals with the stress of emergency medical work, Lars said that he doesn't drink but admits that his does smoke quite a bit.

"I also believe in the idea of 'heal thyself'. It is not easy to turn to my family for support because of the language problems... Anyway, I have been doing this type of work for a long time so I am used to it," he said.


While life in Phuket is going well, Lars admits that he does need to improve his language skills. Unlike most Swedes living in Phuket, he is not fluent in English – and his Thai language skills are minimal.

His co-workers at Kusoldharm have encouraged him to study Thai, he added with a laugh.

Lars enjoys his life as a rescue team member and plans to continue doing it as long as he can. "I think I might have a guardian angel looking over me, helping me from being in the wrong place at the wrong time," he said.

Perhaps to the accident victims he helps, Lars himself appears to be a guardian angel.

f there's a better way to spend a Friday night than sitting around on a few sofas with friends, sharing drinks and conversation, I don't know what it is.



Good girls learn to strip

or foreign tourists, women and men, visiting Bangkok, it is hard to avoid a tour of at least one of the many night entertainment strips in Patpong, Nana Plaza or Soi Cowboy where the chief attraction is scantily-clad women go-go dancing. The Thai "stripper", even if she doesn't remove her clothes, has become ingrained in Bangkok's international image.

However, for many Thais of the middle and upper strata of Thai society, which is quite conservative, that image is a foreign

"Thai society is extreme. One side is very conservative while another side is very open," said Busakorn Vorameth, 36, owner and chief instructor of Rumpuree Dance Studio, on the fifth floor of the upmarket Amarin Plaza, in central Bangkok.

"I believe that conservative people want to express their emotions as well but they can't," said K. Busakorn, who graduated with a master's degree in design management from Harvard University in the US.

K. Busakorn, who works as an architect during the day, decided to open the Rumpuree Dance Studio less than a year ago to share her passion for dancing with others at night.

Six months ago she began offering classes in erotic dancing and striptease, which she had taken classes in for fun while working as an architect in New York.

"At first I didn't dare to open a striptease class, because I was not sure if Thai people could accept it," she said. "It could have drawn criticism."

Instead, her classes drew a lot of media attention and plenty of interested customers – mostly educated, upper-middle-class career women between the ages of 20 to 50 who have found that erotic dancing helped them reduce their stress levels.

"I'm learning striptease be-

cause I love dancing," said Kewalin Sukapiboon, 33, a nurse at a leading private hospital.

"It is fun, like I am playing a role. In daily life, I never do that, so when I finally dance my stress is released. I feel relaxed. Besides, this kind of dancing is a good exercise because it uses a lot of muscles."

During the first half hour, K. Busakorn relaxes her students with soft music and dim lights in the room while teaching them to stretch their muscles.

The music's tempo is then turned up as she starts teaching her pupils how to make sexy

dance steps and enticing movements in front of the mirror.

There was plenty of laughas these career ladies watched themselves in the mir-

"The striptease I am learning is not like what saucy nightclub entertainers are doing," said Reiko Sakamoto, 36, a manager at the Senju Metal Trading Company. "They do something a bit similar with the expression of sexiness, but it's not the same."

K. Busakorn believes that women are sexier when they feel relaxed. "Sexiness is always from inside. Nobody can pretend to be sexy. Especially, in such a plastic world today, it is hard to get back to the nature," she said.

"This is why this type of dancing is different from others. Striptease isn't only about learning a pattern of body movement, but also about emotional expression, which is sexually explicit," she said.

"This is the principle of the striptease. To get people to feel free to express themselves," she

K. Busakorn insisted, "Striptease is an art, not just a dirty dance to arouse men's sexual desire. Striptease makes a dancer feel more comfortable to their bodies and also has psychological benefit.


"Many women are not selfconfident, and are uncomfortable expressing their feelings, but inside they really want to do so. Striptease makes them think that to release their emotion is not a bad thing."

K. Busakorn's striptease philosophy, unfortunately, may be lost on the thousands of go-go girls engaged in erotic dancing in Bangkok for a living, rather than as a hobby.

She said she understood that these women were dancing for money, and probably couldn't afford her classes at 300 baht an hour, but she refuses to call what they do art.

"I don't think Thailand has real striptease, even at Patpong. I don't see girls in Patpong dancing, they just move their bodies a bit," she said.

he bob hairstyle has maintained it's traditional shape since it was invented nearly a century ago. In recent years, however, many stylists in Thailand and abroad have taken the initiative to transform the classic cut into one that incorporates modern trends reflective of the individuals who sport it.

A trek to a few select salons in Phuket City revealed what variations of the bob style are in vogue in Phuket, as well as some handy hints about choosing the right style and how to keep your bob looking good.

Suphakorn Sriketsurakul has worked as a stylist for more than 20 years and is currently working at S Hair Design, a subsidiary of Adam Hairdo.

"The current popular style in Thailand is the retro bob haircut that, traditionally, is about chin length at the front and tapers along the jawline to a shorter length in the back," he said.

"The bulk of the hair rests between the individual's ears and chin, and creates a sharp-angled style to the cut."

However, the style of bob cut depends on the individual wearing it, since it is necessary to take into account the facial structure, personality and whether the person prefers the traditional cut or wants to experiment with a unique style, K. Suphakorn said.

Another important factor is the person's level of confidence, since not all individuals wish to have a distinctive cut that sets them apart from the crowd.

Perhaps not surprising, in Phuket many ladies after a different look are choosing to color their hair as well. "Light brown has been the color of choice as of late here at the shop," K. Suphakorn said.

"The coloring is done so that the light brown is accented with highlights which subtly lift color from the hair in specific sections to mimic the lightening effects that would normally result from sunlight.

"This complements the skin tones of most Thais quite well. Fairer-skinned people have free rein in their choice of color since most choices will not clash with their

skin tone. But depending on the color chosen, it may attract some odd glances if it strays outside the realm of natural hair colors," he added.

Anchleeporn Treesungsuwan, owner of Anchaleeporn Haircare Center in Samkong, Phuket City, said, "We have taken the traditional straight-cut bob a step further by incorporating both curly and wavy textures, as well as altering the

length to make it less of an angular cut."

K. Anchleeporn suggested to those who frequently change their hair color, "An essential service is hair detoxing, which revitalizes the hair after it has undergone harsh chemical treatments from both bleaching and coloring.

"It is vital to do this so breakage is minimized and the overall integrity of the hair is maintained. The detox can be done

immediately after the treatment or within the week that follows.

"We recommend that customers who drastically alter the color of their hair on a regular basis have the detox performed on a monthly basis. The process usually takes about an hour and rejuvenates the hair, leaving it shiny and healthy," she said.

Thanida Rodsunthon, owner of Best Hair shop, said the bob's versatility makes it one of the most popular styles at her salon.

The cut suits teenagers, the fashionconscious woman who wants that swank look and the businesswoman who needs to balance trend-setting style with something appropriate to the office, she said.

"For a businesswoman, the bob can be modified so the hair remains roughly shoulder length, without cutting large portions around the neckline," she explained.

K. Thanida also discussed the benefits of highlighting or lowlighting hair. "People often confuse the two or are unsure which will look better for them," she said.

"Highlights lighten and brighten the hair while lowlights deepen and darken the hair. Highlights often use blond, gold or chamomile tones and lowlights use red, violet or orange tones," she explained.

"Both provide a great way to update your look without making a too-drastic change to your hair. The tones should not be any lighter or darker than three to four tones from your natural hair color, otherwise the results will be too harsh and unnatural," she added.

ne of the key aspects of Thai cuisine that has made it popular around the world is the plethora of Thai herbs used in everything from four-course meals to the 30-baht lunch. These often include those perennial favorites, ginger, galangal, lemongrass and kaffir lime leaves, but have you ever tried *reo*, aka bustard cardamom?

A member of the ginger family, in Thailand *reo* is most popular in Chanthaburi province and is rarely used in preparing dishes in Phuket, except at *Kuayteaw Moo Liang* (carda-

mom pork noodle) restaurant on Thepkrasattri Rd.

Restaurateur Naphaporn "Nui" Panbanpaew, 44, hails from Pattani, but got the recipe

for her signature noodles from a friend from Chanthaburi more than 14 years ago. She said the original recipe was very sweet, so she adapted it for southern palates by making it more spicy.

Liang, as in the restaurant name, is a Thai soup made from a variety of herbs mashed together and boiled into soup, with a key ingredient being bustard cardamom root. Cardamom looks similar to galangal but has a distinctive sweet taste and smell.

As with most local herbs, *reo* can be used also as a remedy. The special ingredient, while tasty in itself, is also reputed to ease a queasy stomach and soothe indigestion.

The soups at K. Nui's restaurant include a wide range of noodles, including *yentafo*. However, K. Nui's *yentafo* recipe is

also a variant from the *yentafo* served at most small eateries in Phuket, which generally use red beans to give the noodles their pink allure.

K. Nui, however, uses tomato juice, which adds a twist to her *yentafo*'s flavor.

And just in case her southern adaptations prove too spicy, there are also Thai sweets and fresh coconut-milk ice cream to cool down with after the meal.

Kuayteaw Moo Liang is on Thepkrasattri Rd, opposite the Esso gas station. Open 10:30 am to 4 pm, closed Sundays.

The volunteers travel to exotic locations, but rather than lying on a beach or browsing bazaars, they spend their vacations helping the community – and getting out just as much as they put in, if not more.

Earthwatch aims to match volunteers to scientific projects to promote sustainable conservation of TRAVELER the world's natural assets. For volunteers, it's a highly

worthwhile and intimate voyage of discovery. In return, the Earthwatch scientists, dubbed Principal Investigators, or PIs, get a bunch of free and very enthusiastic assistants. So everybody benefits.

The range and depth of Earthwatch projects is amazing. Volunteers signing up for one of its programs could find themselves tasked to collect more than 100 species of butterflies in Vietnam's Tam Dao National

or much of the past four Park, documenting the architecture, history and folklore of a traditional Chinese village before its inhabitants are relocated, or helping to preserve the natural and heritage attributes of Truk Lagoon's WWII diving sites in Micronesia.

The Earthwatch teams are usually quite small, with a maximum of 15 volunteers, and range in age from 16 to 85. They're drawn from all around the world Founded in Boston in 1971, and from a variety of professions

Apart from a reasonable level of fitness, no special skills are required, and PIs brief volunteers on the project and what they are expected to do when they arrive. Earthwatch also stresses the need to fit in with the local environment and to respect indigenous customs.

For the PIs involved with the Earthwatch projects, introducing a cosmopolitan bunch of outsiders to their work is time-

Dr Mary Littrell, who has worked for Earthwatch in Mumbai, said, "Our research with artisans grounds us in the hardships of daily life in India – yet they continually inspire us by the beauty that they produce under such difficult circumstances.

"Earthwatch gives us the chance as researchers to share that exhilaration with others at a very personal level.'

Botanist Dr Susan Kephart, who has been involved with Earthwatch for many years, added, "I've overseen volunteers who are teenagers and volunteers who've retired - and one group included folks from the US, Uzbekistan, Vietnam, Ghana and

catching and pinning insects, a cell biologist and a radiologist who were great with microscope work, and an expert on Dr Seuss, the children's author, who kept morale high!"


Just as Earthwatch volunteers spend much of their time working rather than relaxing – although a free day or two is usually allotted for sightseeing there is of course no free lunch.



McMurtry meanderings

arry McMurtry has written 29 novels, so they all can't be deathless works of high literature. His early novels were literary: Horseman, Pass By and All My Friends are Going to be Strangers about modern Texas, as was his mid-life masterpiece, the

great Pulitzer-Prize winning *Lonesome Dove* about the Texas of the great cattle drive days.

But he does crank out some stuff for pure entertainment and moneymaking reasons, and one such piece is *Telegraph Days* (Pocket Star Books, New York, 2006, 405pp).

The conceit is that this is a tale of the Old West as told by a spunky independent

woman in the mode of the successful novel and film *True Grit*. But the language isn't that colorful, the characters aren't vivid and the plot isn't gripping. *Telegraph Days* instead limps along with flaccid language, cardboard characters and an aimlessly meandering plot.

It's 1875 and Nellie Courtright's father has just "suicided himself" on a lonely ranch in Oklahoma. Nellie and her 17-year-old brother head for the rundown village of Rita Branca. Nellie is 22 and "kissable". So far in her progress from Virginia she has kissed Wild Bill Hickock and General George Custer.

"Here we were, the two surviving Courtrights, having already, in the course of our westering progress, buried two little brothers, three little sisters, an older sister, three darkies, our mother, and now look! Father's tongue was black as a boot."


Her brother Jackson gets a job as deputy sheriff while Nellie takes over the village telegraph station. One day the six notorious Yazee bandit brothers ride into town and Jackson, by a fluke, manages to gun each of them down with shots to the heart.

Nellie writes up the story and the town is flooded with reporters, one of whom, Z enas Clarke, becomes her lover and later her husband.

The parade of famous Western characters now continues with the arrival of Buffalo Bill.

"I had pretty well convinced myself that this Buffalo Bill Cody was probably somebody who needed to be put in his place... The man might well have an irksome personality. When Thursday came I got ready to be icy and stiff, but then up Bill Cody trotted, on a fine gray horse, beautifully dressed, handsome as a god, friendly as a collie, and all my tough resolves turned into toffee."

The final half of the book is a series of desultory adventures in which Nellie

boyfriend's newspaper at the time and the two go off to run a magazine in California, which leads up to the movie-making era in which Lillian Gish plays Nellie on the day of the big gunfight against the Yazee brothers.

What McMurtry wrings out of this picaresque tale isn't much. There is no suspense and little humor. The descriptive scenes are weak and the action perfunctory.

Occasionally he can wind up a crisp bit of dialog. Here, for example, is Nellie reporting at the bank in North Platte to exercise Buffalo Bill's power of attorney. The fat banker, Senior Applewhite, is skeptical that "a slip of a girl be allowed to make free use of the Cody funds".

"Have you known Mr. Cody long?" the ample banker asked.

"Long enough to know he doesn't flinch from expense and extravagance," I said.

"Are you his harlot?" he asked.

"How'd you like it to catch an inkwell in the middle of the forehead?" I responded, standing up. "When I tell Bill Cody what you said I have no doubt that he'll come back here and pound you into blubber!"

But for the most part each short listless chapter follows another in a meaningless plot and by the end you suspect that the author is as tired of the tale as you are

Icons R Us

Despite a push by the interim government for people and organizations to adopt HM the King's "Sufficiency Economy" principles, Phuket has clearly retained its uncanny ability to attract big, bold development schemes, both from the government and private sectors.

In the past few month alone, there have been private sector initiatives to build a man-made island to cater to the yachting needs of the word's richest people, followed by a raucous public hearing on the need for the ambitious Phase II of the Chalong Marina plan.

These two schemes combined would pale into insignificance if the futuristic Phuket Bay "International Convention, Exhibition, Entertainment & Resort Complex" ever becomes reality.

Earlier this year, a proposal was put forward to build a tsunami barrier that would automatically pop up in the nick of time, protecting Patong Bay from the ravages of any future tsunamis.

Back on dry land, investors last week came to meet the governor to sound out the possibility of constructing a cable car to transport holiday-makers up to a scenic vista in the hillsides above Patong (see News pages).

In January 2003, Srimuang Charoensri, then a member of the Senate Committee on Communications, became the latest official to propose the construction of a tunnel under Patong Hill to ease traffic congestion and reduce road accidents there.

Slowly nearing completion in the Nakkerd Hills, on what was once government virgin forest land, is what promises to be Phuket's newest icon: the Mingmongkol Buddha image, a 45-meter-high colossus built on donations by faithful Buddhists "finding their ways to leap out from sufferings to face the enduring happiness", according to the project's fund-raising website.

Another icon to be open soon is the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization's long-delayed, 46-million-baht "Welcome Gate" project at Tah Chat Chai.

Two other ambitious plans that threaten to leave much of Tah Chat Chai covered in concrete are the large sports complex and the international convention center, both on Treasury Department land.

If and when all of these projects are completed, Phuket will likely have more icons than a computer desktop – but much less of the natural beauty that attracted most residents in the first place.

When a new government is elected, let's see if it identifies environmental protection as its top priority and takes steps to preserve what is left of Phuket's natural beauty after decades of poorly-regulated, greed-driven development. A good first step would be immediate funding for a second incinerator at Saphan Hin.

Display your prices, or suffer market forces

n March 6 the Internal Trade Department updated the list of goods and services for which prices must be displayed. Prices must be shown for 232 categories of goods and 47 types of services.

The list is comprehensive and includes categories instead of specific products, so that nearly all products and services are included, from pens to washing liquids and fabric softeners and even cars and haircuts.

However, many vendors continue to break this law, even though we keep carrying out random inspections and publicize that complaints can be made by calling our 24-hour consumer rights hotline at 1569. Some vendors still do not realize that displaying prices is necessary.

Most of the complaints we get from our hotline center are about vendors not displaying prices. The second most common complaint is about gas stations displaying one price on the signs and charging a different price at the pumps.

Since October last year we have fined 11 vendors for not displaying prices. The punishment is a fine, from 400 baht to 10,000 baht, depending on the size and type of business registered.

However, since not displaying prices has become punishable by law, vendors are starting to take heed. Also, our campaigns have become more successful

The Phuket Internal Trade Office (PITO) has launched its annual campaign for all vendors to display prices for products and services, as required by law since 2000.

Here PITO Chief Somphot Sungkhaphong explains why his office stages this campaign every year, and why he thinks it is a critical part of eliminating dual pricing in Phuket.



since we started using the media to inform vendors they must display their prices.

In Phuket the usual way of doing business is as a 'Thai-style' family business, such as the stalls at the market, and they never display prices.

Most family businesses keep the cost price in mind or written down where the whole family can see it, then charge customers a little more than the cost price. But problems arise when one member of the family sells a product at one price and another family member sells the same product at a different price.

When we go out and inspect vendors, there are always some without prices on display. Some vendors tell us that they didn't know that it is required by law; others say it is too complicated because the prices keep changing. For example, at the fresh markets prices may change many times throughout a single day.

Some shops, especially souvenir shops, mark their products with two prices – one for tourists and one for local people.

By law prices for products must be clearly displayed. It is legal, however, to have a price on an item but charge some people less than the price displayed.

However, only one price must be displayed. Although it is up to vendors whether to offer certain people discounts, we urge them to understand what effect this might have.

Phuket is a tourism province, so if vendors price their goods properly it will benefit the entire province.

Tourists would see that we are fair and hold the same standards for everybody, not having one price for Thais and another for foreigners.

Indeed, the days of charging different prices might be nat-

urally drawing to an end as more large retailers, businesses run by foreigners and businesses managed to international standards open on Phuket.

By clearly displaying prices, such businesses are elevating trading standards in Phuket. This makes tourists feel good about visiting and shopping here.

This is also one of the reasons why these businesses have so many customers. Consumers can see the correct price before making the decision whether or not to buy the product. It even helps employees at the store and the businesses benefit by having a good reputation.

If we are very strict in enforcing the law, it might not lead to success. We have to convince vendors to appreciate the big picture and understand why franchise convenience stores and large retailers are becoming so popular, as well as the general effect on Phuket as a tourism province.

I urge all vendors who still do not display their prices to consider all these factors. Phuket is very competitive, so vendors must promote their products well, including prices, to remain competitive. Something as simple as this may well keep them in business.

Also, it's the consumer's right to know the price before making the decision to buy.

What are my options as far as a generator is concerned? Does somebody have a suggestion?

Ekkachok Tantipareepan of the Phuket Provincial Electricity Authority replies:

Rain should not affect houses though it might affect big businesses that are using a lot of power.

Sometimes the electrical power is cut when there is an accident and someone runs into and knocks down a power pole, or if an animal falls against the wires and short-circuits them.

These things are more likely during heavy rain. You should also check and make sure your home doesn't have an overload. If, after you check and if there are no problems at your home, please call our office at 076-210427-8 and we can have an officer come and check your home to see what the problem might be.

Health regulations for foreign worker camps

About six months ago, a foreign worker camp turned up overnight on a patch of land down the road from my house in Soi Samakkea. The "camp" consists of several corrugated iron sheds.

The owner of the land, who leased it to a construction company to house their workers, tells me that more than 100 Burmese men, women and children are housed at the site.

Sanitary services consist of just four lavatories, which appear to lack a proper sewage treatment system incorporating a septic tank. In my view, the conditions are ripe for outbreaks of dysentery, cholera, typhoid – or all three.

Are there any regulations on the number of people who can be housed on a certain size plot?

Also, are there regulations covering the sanitary arrangements for that number of people?

There are many other such camps around; this is not an isolated instance.

John Quemener Rawai An officer at the Phuket Provincial Office of Labour Protection and Welfare replies:

There are regulations covering hygiene at worker camps. They apply to laborers, regardless of nationality.

The requirements regarding maintaining hygiene at worker camps are listed in Thai on our website at: www. labour.go.th/ welfare/

The contractor who employs the laborers are responsible for ensuring that the camp is hygienic and complies with the regulations.

Regarding toilets, all the regulations say is that the employer must provide enough toilets and clean water for the employees.

If there is an outbreak of a communicable disease, the Phuket Provincial Health Office will be called in to help.

Z: In fact, I have devised a system for classifying people ac-


r Zoltan Rhubarb, an cording to the shape of the head. Using my system, you can predict with reasonable accuracy what a person's character will be like, and even what his future will

Setting up your home gym

ou want to be fit. You want to be healthy. You want to get rid of that little bit of extra weight without giving up your Friday night bottle or twelve pack of beer or your morning pastries. But, like so many people, you're also loath to go to a sweaty, busy and expensive gym.

Luckily for you, home fitness is a few purchases away.

However, with so many options on the market these days, deciding what to buy when setting up a home gym can be quite confusing. Let's take a look at a few of the most common equipment and rate them in terms of effectiveness.

Treadmill: It is perhaps unfortunate that this particular piece of equipment has a name synony mous with drudgery and boredom, because it is in fact one of the better choices in home fitness equipment.

Walking – and for some people running – is a naturally great fitness activity that, when performed correctly, results in reduced bodyfat levels and increased cardiovascular fitness.

By "performed correctly" I mean working within a designated heart rate range. This range, which varies from person to person, takes into account such individual factors such as size. weight and age.

There are numerous treadmill models available on the market, with prices to suit just about every budget. The best choices have good shock absorption characteristics, plenty of length and width, and a digital display with distance, speed and possibly heart rate, course alternatives and an automatic incline feature.

Stationary bike: Although not as effective as the treadmill in terms of bodyfat reduction, stationary bikes are great for improving cardiovascular fitness as well as leg strength and muscle tone. More common varieties include the spinning bike, recumbent and standard upright bike.

Although the spinning bikes do not have digital displays, they do allow the rider to sit in a more correct position than the other alternatives. Similar to treadmills, the better recumbent and standard bikes will have course alternatives and speed, distance and heart rate displays.

Elliptical trainer: Also called "cross trainers", this in another good option that offers the user a similar body action to running and, on some models with hand levers, cross country skiing. Great fitness gains and calorie expenditure can be expected with regular use on this machine.

With continual foot to pedal contact, there is no shock absorption through the legs. This makes the elliptical trainer great for the many people who suffer from knee problems.

Stepping machines: Climbing stairs is never easy or enjoyable, so why replicate the action on a piece of equipment and expect the user to spend long periods of training time performing this ac-

As you may have guessed, I am not a fan of steppers. The

piston-like leg action replicates the one used when climbing hills or resistance on a bike in the standing position. Only really useful when

used for short periods, in conjunc- stable platform – great for core tion with other pieces of equip-strength and stability.

Free weights and weight machines: Any balanced fitness training program will include an element of strength work.

Depending on your budget, you have the choice of spending small and going for a few sets of dumbbells and a bench - or spending large and selecting several resistance machines.

Unless you are lucky enough to live in a palace or mansion, a home gym will normally be confined to a small space, so a compact option is the best one.

There are several multi-sta-

tion or multi-purpose cable machines available here in Phuket. Both allow the user to perform several movements and train all parts of the body via the one piece of equipment.

To supplement this machine, a selection of dumbbells from five to thirty pounds and a fit ball are good choices. The fit ball, also known as a Swiss ball or pilates ball, is a large inflatable sphere that provides an unstable platform from which many exercises can

be performed.

The body responds to the instability of the ball by using more muscles than it would on a more

Workout room: Obviously, you need space to move onto and around your exercise equipment. Measure your floor space before making any purchase and design a floor plan according to the exact measurements of your equipment.

Exercise creates body heat and our natural method to keep core body temperature down is sweating. Sweat evaporates on the skin with passing wind flow, which, in turn, cools down the blood and internal organs.

In Phuket, you must have either a sound air conditioning unit

with the appropriate BTU rating for your room size or a strong fan which can direct airflow over you at all times during training.

Also, consider which room will offer the best protection from direct sunlight.

The last consideration is floor covering. A durable, non-slip surface is best. An excellent option are soft rubber tiles that are designed specifically for gymnasiums and are available here in Phuket.

Wooden floorboards and ceramic tiles are too hard and potentially slippery, while carpeting is not only hot but may also harbor dust, mold and any number of microbes.

Plan your budget, create the space at home and seek professional advice on the best choices for your own fitness needs.

Finally, remember that motivation and direction are not supplied with your fitness equipment purchase. If you lack these, your home gym will become just another spare room – no matter how well equipped it may be.



over Patong Hill, turn left on Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd, go past the Post Office and turn right imme-

diately after Thanachart Bank into Aroonsom Plaza. Just after the CAT office and before the entrance to Andaman Beach Suites, at BYD Lofts, turn left. We're there on the right.

If you can't make it this week, not to worry. I'll be there next week, too. And the next.

Switched on: I received a fascinating – and deadly accurate – message from David Kirk the other day. If you're thinking about shelling out big baht for a fancy TV, David's imagined conversation warrants your consideration. With his permission, I reprint it here more-or-less verbatim:

"So there I was contemplating handing over half-amillion baht for a fancy LCD TV. A thought came to me, and I asked a particularly intelligentlooking clerk, 'Will this gorgeous TV be compatible with my current DVD player? Will I need a special cable or adapter to get the same quality of picture that I can currently see on this HD (high definition) LCD screen?'

'Oh yes sir, you won't be able to get this clarity from your existing DVD player. You need one of these,' he explained pointing to a very smart looking box.

'No problem, I will hand you over another half-million baht for this HD DVD player,' I said reluctantly.

'Well the problems don't really end there. You see you can't buy high-definition DVDs in Thailand, and we don't sell HD DVD players.

'So why are you demonstrating a product with a picture quality that the customer will not be able replicate at home?'

'Bait sir, and unlike you most customers get hooked on this demo quality and don't ask If you plan on watching satellite broadcast shows on your new ultradeluxe 42-inch LCD or plasma TV, be aware that the picture won't look much better than that on a traditional 7,000-baht 21-inch TV set.

these questions, so they are conned into buying HD TVs. It doesn't end there; as soon as they turn on their terrestrial or satellite cable reception the picture is 10 times worse than the DVD quality. What we are showing here is in ef-

fect a complete illusion.'

Of course the above conversation is completely fabricated, but nevertheless the facts are correct and extracting them was like trying to get blood out of a

While in Bangkok last week I did a huge amount of research on this. Everyone I talked to said the Panasonic Viera plasma high-definition TVs ran rings around the competition. I looked at the same movie on the Viera and then on the half-million-baht LCD TV, and for sure you could see the plasma was infinitely better, with no "shake" or "motion pattern noise", as they say in the trade.

Price-wise, the Viera 42" model lists at 129,990 baht, but I saw it offered for 75,000 baht with a DVD player thrown in.

As for getting a demonstration of terrestrial or satellite TV, the retail shops were loathe to give one. Eventually a shop at the Emporium let me see just how bad it can be. Seemingly, it's the old technology being beamed into the new technology, and for sure they are not compatible.

Although I agree with David's observations, my take on the matter is a little different. I have a new 27" Dell monitor that runs 1920x1200 pixels. That means it shows full 1080p "true high-defi-

nition TV" pictures in 16:9 aspect ratio without any munging of the signal. (For a discussion of 1080p and other truly inscrutable TV terms, see en.wikipedia.org/wiki/ 1080p).

UBC TV's Star network, based in Hong Kong, recently ran a Star Wars movie marathon, with each of the movies in digitally re-mastered, high-definition 16:9 format. In Phuket, they looked like crap. If you lived in Hong Kong and watched the HDTV version of Star Wars, you saw the re-mastered high definition version of Star Wars – a truly awesome experience. If you live in Phuket, the UBC TV satellite set-top box – at least, the one that I rent from UBC doesn't even have a Super VHS plug, much less a set of three composite DVD-quality video

The video quality of satellite TV in Phuket is limited to a "yellow RCA" video connector, or standard antenna co-ax. Virtually every TV made since the mid-1990s has an SVHS plug. UBC doesn't.

Eagerly anticipating the Star Wars marathon, I fed the co-ax output from my UBC box to my new 27" monitor, and I couldn't bear to look at the result. George Lucas's masterpiece appeared as though it were shot with the lens on a telephone camera.

On that point, David and I agree. Here's where I differ: I've found that downloaded HD videos – TV shows recorded in the US or Europe, or ripped (and most frequently illegal) DVDs offered on the Web – play with astoundingly good quality. All it takes is Windows Media Player 11 under Windows XP or Vista, a hefty video card and a big monitor.

Toss in a great sound system and a bucket of popcorn and a drink, and Pirates of the Caribbean will put the swash back in your buckle.

his week's article will discuss two completely different Fund Management Groups with only one area in common: their head offices, which are in London.

The first group, Matrix Money Management London, has teamed up with Stillwater Capital Partners, a US-based investment house. Stillwater Capital specializes in asset-backed lending and the Matrix Asset-Based 2 Fund invests in a fund of hedge funds employing these strategies.

The fund targets a 10% annualized return with very low volatility in the range of 1-2% annualized. It has a low correlation to equities, bonds and other hedge fund strategies. The fund offers an extremely diversified portfolio with a minimum of 30 underlying managers who, in turn, will be diversified across 30 to 100 positions each. The aim of this strategy is to produce consistent predictable returns.

Asset-backed lending is a relatively new entrant to the hedge fund universe and has virtually nothing in common with most hedge fund strategies. This reflects the reality of how diversified hedge funds can be, with strategies so different that they bear almost no relationship to each other.

Asset-backed lending primarily originates loans to smalland medium-sized companies, secured against their assets rather than their operations or future business prospects. These loans are generally secured against a specific asset of the company, which is typically taken outside the corporate structure.

The borrowers generally face a liquidity constraint, which is attributable to the timing of their cash flow needs rather than to any inherent weakness in their underlying business.

Asset-backed lenders are able to negotiate pricing which more than compensates for the risks incurred. Pricing usually includes an attractive margin, which

is supplemented by fees and floors on floating lending rates.

The diversification of managers and holdings can lead to around 2,000 underlying positions but also achieves a broad exposure to different industry sectors and countries.

Asset-backed lending (ABL) is increasingly being dominated by specialty finance companies like GE Capital and hedge funds as banks are increasingly unwilling to transact in lending facilities of small sizes. Banks are usually lacking in speed and flexibility in this sector. ABL hedge funds are, broadly speaking, ultra-specialized "niche" finance companies that realize the value of originating, warehousing and managing secured loans and cash-flow producing assets.

The Stillwater New Finance Funds, launched in 2004, have never dropped in value and have returned results inside their targeted range. This approach adds diversification to any portfolio.

The second fund management group, Brandeaux, was featured in last week's article with respect to their ground rent funds. However, this is only part of their business; university student accommodation and key person accommodation being their other major areas.

The name Brandeaux has become very well known in the

offshore investment world and is held in very high regard because of the level of consistency of returns to investors.

University student accommodation is a growing market with around 100 universities in the UK and a student population growing at between 3% to 5% a year.

It is at the affluent end of the market that Brandeaux offers accommodation. Brandeaux typically buys residential blocks holding between 200 and 600 beds. These are either in the format of individual self-contained units, similar to a hotel, or a mixture of self-contained units combined with three- to five-bedroom apartments. One acquisition in 2006 covered 900 beds for students at the University of Birmingham.

The tendency is now for universities to have 50-week scholastic years and there is a very real shortage of quality accommodation in this area. This ensures that the accommodation is virtually fully let – 98% in reality

University years are broken up into three terms and Brandeaux charge students 50% of the annual fee before the commencement of the first term, 30% before the second term and the balance taken before the third term. The Brandeaux funds that specialize in student accommodation ensure future payment by bank or parental guarantees. Losses are historically only in the range of 1% to 2% per annum and this is catered for in the charging structure. Brandeaux are currently negotiating with four different groups for new student accommodation, two of these are expected to be finalized during June 2007.

The historical returns for the Brandeaux student accommodation fund average an annualized rate of 9.36% and in the latest 12 months, 10.78%. In addition, Brandeaux offer "mixed" funds which consist of 65% ground rent, 30% student accommodation and 5% key personnel accommodation. These funds are available in three currency classes: pound sterling, US dollar and euros and have been very successful. For example, the sterling fund averages and annualized rate of 10.1% and in the latest 12 months, 12.8%.

The demand for student accommodation is driven by the continuing increase in the number of students in higher education and the attraction of the UK as a leading destination for international students. Sector growth, and thus fund performance, is not correlated to the UK economic cycle or to the general UK residential property market.


Brandeaux pre-lets over 50% of its beds to leading UK universities under nomination or lease agreements, which are typically multi-year and allow for annual rental increases at market rates (5%+). Brandeaux now has 30 buildings, purpose-built to a high standard, in 13 cities across the UK.

Brandeaux entered the student accommodation market in the late 1990's. None of its funds have ever reflected negative performance. Its website is: www.brandeaux.com

I have written about Brandeaux student accommodation in the past but with its continued, and even improving returns, it is worthy of inclusion here.

Jatukham fever shows no sign of breaking

PHUKET City: Jatukham Ramathep amulets and shops that sell them seem to be springing up all over Phuket, reflecting the hope that springs eternal among their devotees.

The amulets, priced from 50 baht to several hundred thousand baht, have become the latest craze - not just in Phuket but across the country and even abroad.

Nationwide, the business was estimated to be worth 20 billion baht in 2006, according to research by Kasikorn Research Center.

Shops selling the Jatukham amulets have been operating in Phuket for more than a decade, but it is only in the past several months that the number and visibility of these shops has skyrocketed, following a spate of media reports about the amulets.

In the past two or three months alone, between 10 and 20 new amulet shops and stalls have opened across Phuket, said Panya Ruengsawang, owner of one of the oldest Jatukham shops in Phuket City, on Rassada Rd near the Suriyadet Circle.

He estimates that about one million baht exchanges hands every day in Phuket's Jatukham trade.

three amulet shops in Phuket to serve amulet lovers. However, in the past year Phuket has seen at least 10 new shops. During the most recent Jatukham boom over the past two or three months, another 10 to 20 amulet shops have opened," said K. Panya, 55.

Originally from Nakhon Sri Thammarat, the amulets are believed to bring good luck and business prosperity, which is why younger people and business owners are buying them, K. Pan-

"It used to be that our customers were mostly older folks, but now we have more working men and women, along with teenagers, buying amulets. The local national craze," he said.

"We also have a lot of international business owners who want to take the Jatukham amulets home with them, so they are buying amulets as well. The prices are going up so quickly that sometimes I reserve a top amulet for about 100,000 baht, but before I can even put it in the customers hands the price goes up to 300,000 baht.

"The most sought-after type of Jatukham are of the original Jatukham Hluk Mueng series, produced at Wat Mahatat in 1987. Prices for these generally start at 400,000 to 500,000 per amulet because they are so difficult to find now. The Jatukham Kod Sed Thee (Megarich) is also very popular, especially in Singapore and neighboring countries. Those can fetch between 60,000 and 80,000 baht each."

The boom in amulet shops in Phuket is helping K Panya's shop. Although there are fewer customers, they are buying more expensive amulets.

"I don't have as many customers as I used to because there are so many shops to choose from now," he said. "I used to turn a profit of 800 to 2,000 baht per day, but since the Jatukham boom started three months ago, my profit jumped to 4,000 to 6,000 baht per day. Some shops have more than 10,000 baht per day profit."


K. Panya said that he expects the prices, and profits, from Jatukham amulets to continue to increase in Phuket, especially if more miracles are attributed to them in the media.

With so may people getting in on the Jatukham bandwagon, perhaps it should come as little surprise that the government is seeking for ways to get its share of the spoils.

In late April, Revenue Department Director-General Sanit Rangnoi said the department was sending officials to check the estimated income from Jatukham transactions and was considering whether to tax enterprises related to the soaring sales of the

"There is a tremendous amount of money floating around in the amulet market. If the production of the talismans is for commercial purposes, it should be taxed. If the production is done purely out of faith, it may be exempt," he said.

Thus far there has been no announcement that the Revenue Department was planning to move forward with the tax.

Sawasdee aims for 2010 completion

awasdee Residence, a residential villa development in the foothills north of Patong, has begun building its first display home with the aim of completing the development by 2010.

Close to the heart of Patong but far enough to avoid the traffic and noise, the luxury pool villa development by Thai developer Sawasdee Residence Co Ltd has launched its project on 10 rai on the east side of Phra Barami Rd.

home, which is expected to be completed within the next three months. We will start the C- and A-type show homes around October. We expect that the project will be completed within three years."

"The property market is slowing down, especially in developments that are not located in seaview locations.

"For us I think that when the show homes are finished, they will help our market run easier," K. Pawat said.

"Our B-type show home will take about three more months to complete because we would like to have the best interior detail.

'With the premium-grade materials and luxury design, I think it's a good value for the price," he added.

Each of the 10 A-type villas will have three bedrooms and three bathrooms. On the ground floor, the living and dining room will be connected, but the main kitchen and a Thai kitchen will be

There will also be a washing room, a maid's room and a carport for two cars. Total usable

area for A-type villas is 336sqm, including an infinity-edge swimming pool measuring 3.8 meters by 7.4m.

The B-type villas will have four bedrooms and four bathrooms, with 359sqm of usable

While B-types have a similar design to the A-type villas, the fourth bedroom will be on the ground floor with bay windows looking out over the private pool. There will be eight B-type villas in the project.


"The villa's design is a mix of modern and contemporary design, since we didn't want to have the Thai-style design seen in so many projects."

modern, two-story house near Natai Beach, Phang Nga, is waiting for new owners. The house is three kilometers north of the Sarasin Bridge and a couple minutes' drive from Natai Beach, with its five-star resorts, including the Aleenta Resort and Spa.



get bored with 'experts'. Far too full of their own importance for my liking. They're just so... well... smug. These people are interviewed on television and appear in the newspapers espousing their supposedly irrefutable views on the most bizarre of subjects.

Then someone else with an equally silly haircut and 1960's National Health Service spectacles (not an attractive look) will come along and proclaim that actually they'd gotten it all wrong and that you should ignore everything previously mentioned on the subject and start again.

Salt is a good example. For years, salt was considered to be an essential part of the human diet. Then one of those scientist types appeared on the scene, shoved a few pounds of salt down a rat's throat. The rat didn't take too kindly to this, and died.

The conclusion was obvious – salt was deadly. It gained 'evil' status overnight, and the Western world was told that should we consume too much salt in our diets, that imminent death was in-

get bored with 'experts'. Far evitable. So we stopped eating the too full of their own import-stuff. Food, as a result, is boring.

Interesting experts are few and far between. They all seem to want to do their best to behave like those polo-necked, Arransweatered chaps that appeared late night on BBC2 in the UK back in the '60s and '70s when Open University used to broadcast in black and white. They just seemed so obsessed with their charts and algorithms.

These late-night feasts were entertaining in themselves for a maximum of about five minutes after staggering home from the pub, insisting on a little televisual stimulation. The problem was that once that time had elapsed, you just wanted to throttle them and bring at least a little excitement into their monochrome lives.

Today's most exciting scientist is the one with the least in physical personality, ironically enough. Stephen Hawking. He's brilliant. He doesn't have a wacky haircut or a spotty bow tie; he just sits there and explains things in a way that even I sometimes understand.

He may not be able to talk in the same way that many of us do, but he has a knack of making even those obscure subjects that many of us would runaway screaming from rather interesting, especially in his book A Brief History of Time. I have to say that I agree with the proposition that the unassailable sine qua non for a quantum physicist is that the quintessential homogeneity of Hawking's theory should not be entirely challenged by academic empiricists in absentia.

No, I haven't read it.

And so we move inevitably into things green and tropical. How about *A Brief History of Gardening* instead? Well, tropical gardening actually. There's little point in droning on about tulips and crocuses, when they're much more at home poking their heads through a blanket of frost.

Anyway, most people will know the story of Captain William Bligh, and the Fletcher Christian-led mutiny on board *HMS Bounty*. Perhaps fewer people are familiar with why he went to Tahiti in the first place and why a mutiny, once he left the island, was fairly inevitable.

He was sent there by a wealthy 18th century botanist, Joseph Banks, to collect 1,000 seedlings of a local version of the breadfruit to transport them to the West Indies to feed slaves working on the plantations.

It took almost five months for the seedlings to be ready to be transported, and during this time the sailors had become somewhat fond of the Tahitian ladies. In fact, a writer at the time claimed that "every man had his girl". I can't blame Mr Christian for being a bit miffed at being told they had to move on. As it happens, Captain Bligh did actually deliver the breadfruit seedlings to the West Indies a few years later – but the slaves didn't like it.

Captain Bligh and his merry men weren't the only ones to move plants around the globe in years gone by. On a visit to Guadeloupe, Christopher Columbus was given a weird-looking cone-shaped fruit. The Spanish visitors thought it looked a bit like a pine cone, so they called it a *pina*.

It later became known as the pineapple and found its way to many other tropical parts of the world including Madagascar, India and Hawaii where it was cultivated and became hugely popular. Today, most pineapples come from the Philippines, Malaysia and here in Thailand.

Columbus also 'discovered' the *capsicum*, or chili pepper. Bizarrely, the first seeds he sent back to Europe weren't even used to grow plants to season food; people liked the look of the bright red and orange fruits, and used them for decoration. Very odd. They became so popular in Asia that their Mexican/ South American origins were probably forgotten quite quickly.

Then there are the plants that made it overseas not because they were worth anything commercially, but people simply liked the look of them. The *cordyline*, or ti plant, for example doesn't do much apart from looking good. In fact, early Polynesian visitors to Hawaii found it so impressive that they wove the leaves into *leis* for their priests.

The 'experts' in the world of gardening will put forward a whole list of reasons as to why we have the plants we have in our corner of the globe. Most of them spout twaddle – they're here because our forefathers either thought that they could make money out of them or they looked good. Or both. Simple.

Unfortunately, my 'brief history of gardening' hasn't been as brief as intended; in fact I think I'll need to continue this at a later date. Now where did I put my spotted bow tie?

ooking at the current phenomenal regional expansion of Asian lowcost airlines (LCCs) such as Air Asia, Nok Air, Tiger and Jet Star, the question that always comes up is just how much more market demand can they generate? Is it a fad or is the face of travel evolving into uncharted territory?

According to several local developers, one key trend that is emerging is that the door-to-door access provided by the regional LCC's is becoming a significant factor in new property transac-

Regional aviation analysts are quick to point out that comparisons between the US, Europe and Asia in terms of air travel are not always relevant. Whereas road and rail links within the US and Europe are prevalent ways to travel, in Asia the airways are the "roadways" between key cities and countries. Let's face it, not many people will be driving to Hong Kong or Bali on their next holiday.

Developing Asian countries with such enormous populations often leapfrog even Western

countries in new technology or trends simply by means of economies of scale.

A case in point is the mobile phone boom in India, where there are hun-

dreds of millions of potential users, it is faster to install modern mobile networks than traditional land lines to keep up with the demand. The

same could easily be said for aviation in Asia which is home to half the world's population.

One of the best case studies of the LCC's has been Air Asia from Malaysia. Coming with a bold Internet booking strategy, providing limited services (with options on a per pay basis) the airline by June 2006 had flown

more than 9 million passengers with just 40 aircraft.

It expects to have nearly 100 aircraft in the skies by 2010 and AirAsia.com is ranked by Google as the No 1 travel site in Asia.

The direct customer approach in booking with the airline and not travel agents, offering lower prices and flexible rates that offer nearly anyone the option of overseas travel is changing the face of the industry.

With the Asian economies currently growing and the emergence of a larger middle class, the region's LCCs are able to service strategic markets, such as China, India, Thailand, Malaysia, the Philippines and Indonesia.

While LCCs are often construed to cater only to those without money, the fact is that it creates more frequent travel among

> a larger market of travelers. It's cheaper for someone who is Singapore-based to fly to Phuket than to spend a weekend in, say, Bintan.

> > Backed by the use of new airplanes and easy webbased reservations, you can plan an international trip with a few clicks of your computer mouse. The

impact this increase in airplane seats has on tourism to a market such as Phuket is significant.

One of the key demand drivers for property is return tourists, who make repeat visits to the island and ultimately end up buying a villa or condo here. In a destination resort such as Laguna Phuket, which has strong

brand equity, a large portion of their residential buyers are guests who have stayed at the resort many times for years. It's a simple equation: the more tourism grows, the greater the impact on property sales.

An interesting development of the LCC's growth is that these carriers are now entering the hotel market. EasyJet has started a hotel brand and now Air Asia has launched Tune Hotels.

In what's bound to raise eyebrows and perhaps cause a few hotel chains to rethink the way they do business, are the innovations of the product. Selling rooms the same as airline seats, direct, prepaid and rates vary depending on how far in advance you book.

Services have been stripped down to offer only a basic room, TV and bathroom, with extras such as air-conditioning and a towel charged if they are requested. There are no phones in the room as they presume everyone already carries a mobile.

Hotel lobby space is leasedout retail space to a convenience shop. Housekeeping and maintenance are outsourced and the average number of staff for a single property is 10. While not suitable for everyone, the product allows a wider range - and a greater number – of people to get on an airplane and have affordable holidays abroad.

Tune has opened its first hotel in Kuala Lumpur and has another 10 under development at locations the airline flies to.

However, the jury is still out on the long-term viability of the LCCs both here and worldwide. In the past, airlines have followed cyclical trends, but as technology changes new startups such as these seem to be able to embrace it and introduce new products at a rate much faster than legacy carriers.

On a recent flight on Tiger Airways from Singapore, I was startled to see business travelers and affluent local residents in greater numbers then I have ever seen before.

For the property development business in Phuket and beyond, the LCCs are going to change the way we see our market for a very long time.
