Policeman accused in teen's death promoted

KRABI: The Phuket Provincial Police officer accused of shooting to death Koh Kaew teenager Worawut Samarnmit, which sparked a mob and a four-hour blockade of Thepkrasattri Rd, has been promoted to the rank of Sergeant Major.

Following the April 18 incident, which is still under investigation, then-Sergeant Prasarn Chuayman was transferred to Krabi

On Monday, June 11, he was promoted.

Sgt Maj Prasarn is under investigation for the shooting of K. Worawut, 17, who was allegedly evading police who had signaled for him to stop his motorbike for a driver's license check about 1 am on the bypass road.

Following the shooting, villagers from Koh Kaew blocked traffic on Thepkrasattri Rd, and only agreed to disband after Provincial Police Deputy Commander Col Chalit Thintanee agreed, in writing, to a series of demands

Among those demands were the immediate suspension of the officer responsible for the shooting and that the officer pay compensation to the family.

According to Phuket City Police Station Superintendent Col Nos Sawetalek, who was also part of the negotiations, no compensation has yet been paid to the family and instead of a suspension, Sgt Maj Prasarn was transferred.

On the night in question, the officer allegedly fired in the direction of K. Worawut and his friends as they sped away on their motorbikes. K. Worawut was shot once in the left hip, his 16-year-old girlfriend who with him at the time later told the *Gazette*.

Mr Wilson suspects someone may have cut the anchor chain, though he admitted he had no proof.

He had just arrived in Phuket after sailing alone for 17 days from Columbo, Sri Lanka.

The pair had gone out to watch other youths race motor-cycles that night, she said.

As the police couldn't see the boy's wound in the dark they didn't believe he was seriously injured and refused to call for help for him.

"It took a long time for anyone to stop and help. By the time they did it was too late," said the girlfriend, who asked that her name not be printed.

K. Worawut was eventually taken to Vachira Phuket Hospital, where he died soon after his arrival.

"There had to have been a better way to make the teenagers stop than shooting at them," said Teewee Samarn after the death of her son.

Asked how the officer could have received a promotion, Col Nos said the promotion was requested before the shooting

took place.

"The promotion was applied for about six months ago, but because the process took so long we received the approval only recently and the award-giving ceremony was held after that," Col Nos said.

"We are still investigating this case. If Sgt Maj Prasarn is found guilty, he will be punished," he said.

Yongyuth Samarnmit, K. Worawut's father, told the *Gazette* that he and his family are still waiting to hear the results of the investigation.

"Although more than a month has passed, we are still sad and we are still waiting for justice in this case," he said.

Sgt Maj Prasarn was among 1,100 police officers in Provincial Police Region 8 who were recently promoted from Sergeant to Sergeant Major.

Shrines to produce 'Chinese' Jatukhams

PHUKET CITY: Three Chinese shrines are joining forces to make Chinese-style versions of the popular Jatukham Ramathep amulet to raise money to build a 60-million-baht VIP wing at Vachira Phuket Hospital.

A press conference was held at Pud Jor Shrine on June 18 to describe the amulet-making process and inform the public how to reserve the amulets.

Since May 9, more than 2.5 million baht in down payments have been placed to reserve the amulets.

The Chinese versions will have a Jatukham image on one side and an image of the Chinese deity Phra Pothisat on the other. Various sizes and types will be available, ranging in price from 99 baht to 599 baht.

Some 200,000 amulets will be made at the Pud Jor Shrine on September 15 and handed over to devotees in a ceremony on September 22.

Vachira Phuket Hospital Director Dr Jessada Chungpaibulpatana said Vachira Phuket needs a new 60-room VIP ward, improvements to increase parking area and medical equipment upgrades.

The new ward would be named "Luang Por Cham Wat Chalong 100 Pi Vachira Phuket", after the revered monk of the same name and the temple where he practiced during his lifetime, he said.

"We hope to raise 20 million baht from the amulet-making," he said.

Amulets can be reserved at Vachira Hospital, Jui Tui Shrine, Pud Jor Shrine and Giw Tien Shrine, all open daily.

Shrimp get ahead with 'blue flag' promotion

PHUKET: In order to help out the island's suffering shrimp farmers, the Phuket Provincial Internal Trade Office (PITO) on June 18 set up a "Blue Flag Shrimp Festival" to sell the crustaceans directly to consumers for 99 baht per kilogram until the end of September.

PITO Chief Somphot Sangkhapong told the *Gazette* that some 1,500 kilograms of Pacific white shrimp (Litopenaeus vanamei) are harvested daily in the province.

"We have about 30 shrimp farms in Phuket, almost all of them in Thalang. Most of these switched from raising giant tiger prawns to Pacific white shrimp, but now there is a glut in the market and prices have fallen," K. Somphot said.

The problem in Phuket reflects a nationwide trend, with decreasing export sales and domestic production continuing to rise all across the country.

As this went to press, Thai shrimp exporters were preparing to lodge two complaints with the World Trade Organization against the US, Thailand's biggest export market, alleging unfair trade practices.

Thai Frozen Foods Association President Poj Aramwattanont said that last year, exports from Thailand reached 193,764 metric tons, three times that from China, the second-biggest supplier.

But in the first two months of this year, total exports were just 1,593 tons, a 95% de-

cline from the same time last year.

K. Somphot urged the public to take advantage of the low prices and encouraged restaurants, hotels and food shops to add shrimp dishes to their menus.

The "Blue Flag Shrimp Festival" will take place at two locations:

-The Esso service station on Thepkrasattri Rd, near Supercheap, open daily from 8 am to 1 pm.

-The Phuket Provincial Commercial Affairs Office, opposite Seng Ho Bookstore on Montri Rd in Phuket City, open Monday to Friday, 3 pm to 6 pm.

Korea pushes for more Thai tourists

PHUKET CITY: The Bangkok office of the Korea Tourism Organization (KTO), Korean Air and Sun Moon Tours & Travel joined forces to promote Thai tourism to Korea with an industry event at The Metropole Hotel on June 14.

Kang Sung-Ghil, Director of the KTO's Bangkok Office said, "Phuket is one of our main markets for MICE [meetings, incentives, conventions and exhibitions], especially incentives. From now on, we must come here more often to give updated information about Korea.

"The event provided useful information about major international trade fairs and tourism attractions in Korea to help in planning incentive tours or educational trips to Korea, as well as pleasure tours.

"We also provided information to encourage travel agents to include Korea in regular tour programs. We would like to encourage travel agents here to become Korea tour specialists in this region," he said.

"Our aim is to increase the number of Thai tourists visiting

Seoul and locations where Korean dramas are filmed, such as Jejudo Island, where the drama *Jung Geum* is filmed. Korean dramas are very popular with Thai people," he explained.

"Seoul is the number one attraction, as it is the heart of Korea, but Jejudo Island is also popular; it is much like Phuket, but has four seasons," he added.

Mr Kang explained that last year some 130,000 Thai tourists visited Korea – a 30% increase in the number of Thai tourists to Korea on the previous year. "People in Phuket and nearby provinces can travel to Korea direct from Phuket as Korean Air operates regular direct flights from Phuket to Incheon International Airport.

However, traveling in the opposite direction, last year about 1.1 million Korean tourists visited Thailand, Mr Kang said.

"Now, in the low season, we have four direct flights a week from Seoul to Phuket and four direct flights a week from Incheon to Phuket, all flown by Korean Air.

"I think this is the same number of flights provided by Thai Airways," he said.

Gold shops boost security

PHUKET: Gold shop owners on Phuket have agreed to increase their security measures in exchange for discounted insurance premiums from the Ministry of Commerce's Department of Insurance.

Phuket Gold Shop Association Chairman Chaiyoot Prayoon-yong stated that the slowdown of the economy has increased the risk of robbery nationwide and that gold shop owners have agreed to upgrade their security, by installing more surveillance cameras, alarms and security bars.

The discounted premiums for gold shop insurance policies were announced on June 6 by the Department of Insurance.

Insurance policies will include coverage for damage or theft of equipment and inventory.

Premiums of 18,800, 32,900 and 47,000 baht per year are offered for coverage of one, two and three million baht, respectively.

K. Chaiyoot, owner of Rassada Gold Shop in Phuket City, said that the discounted premiums were a good idea.

However, he added that he had yet to receive any official documents from the insurance department.

There are about 70 gold shops in Phuket, most are in Phuket City and Patong, he added

"This will be good for gold shop owners. Selling gold depends on economics, if we the have money to buy the best security systems for our shops, we will do so," he said.

Scientists study effects of 2004 tsunami quake

AO MAKHAM: A multinational group of oceanographers has completed a survey of the fault zone that caused the 2004 tsunami and early results show that the quake also caused a massive landslide.

The R/V Roger Revelle, a 75-meter research vessel from the Scripps Institution of Oceanography in California, berthed at the Deep Sea Port at Cape Panwa yesterday after completing a 39-day study of the sea floor that involved coring of seabed sediments.

The focus of the research, led by Dr Chris Goldfinger of Oregon State University, was the the Java Trench subduction zone off the coast of Sumatra, near the epicenter of the 9.3-magnitude earthquake that triggered the 2004 tsunami.

The research team comprised 59 scientists, including oceanographers from Germany, Japan, Spain and Indonesia.

Dr Goldfinger said initial results indicated that the research had detected evidence of the submarine landslide caused by the earthquake, but that the data need further analysis back in the US.

While the research was useful, there is still no way to accurately predict or prevent tsunamis from occurring, Dr Goldfinger said.

For this reason, a reliable early warning system must be

installed in risk areas and people living in such areas must have confidence in it for it to be effective.

The Roger Revelle left Phuket on June 18 to begin its next mission: mapping a 4,000-kilometer volcanic ridge in the Indian Ocean known as the "90-East Ridge", which is the longest of its type on earth.

The research on the 50-day survey will be led by Dr Will Sager, a professor of oceanography at Texas A&M University.

Scientists have believed for many years that the ridge formed naturally from rising magma from the mantle where the Indian Plate

drifted northward into the Eurasian Plate, sequentially forming a line of volcanoes. That theory has come under criticism in recent years, so the mapping will try to determine how the ridge actually formed.

Seismic techniques will be used to probe into the sediment layers.

Another part of the research will involve using 19th-century dredging techniques to collect exposed volcanic rock samples along the ridge flanks, at depths from 2,000 to 4,000 meters. The rocks will then be analyzed onshore for chemical composition and age.

Kajonkietsuksa steps up school security

WICHIT: In response to several calls by parents concerned about stepped-up security at Kajon-kietsuksa School on Chao Fa West Rd, the *Gazette* is happy to report that the new measures are purely precautionary – and not in response to any imminent threat to security at the school.

Nunthiya Lohitchan, a teacher at the school, explained that parents arriving to pick up their kids are now being asked to present school ID cards before being allowed drive cars onto the school grounds.

The ID cards have a photo of the student on one side and their parent or legal guardian on the other.

In addition to keeping unauthorized people off the school grounds, the "Expressway Project", as it is called by the school, is also intended to reduce traffic congestion by allowing parents to pick up their Little Einsteins on a drive-through basis, without having to park.

"Ît's totally unrelated to the security situation in the Deep South or rumors about child abduction, in Phuket or elsewhere," Khru Nunthiya confirmed.

"We put this policy in place for the safety of our students and we think it will increase confidence among their parents," she added.

 Aged between 17 and 24, inclusive, on the date of application;

- No criminal record;
- Has never represented Thailand in an international contest;
- Can communicate well in both Thai and English;
- Not listed on the Immigration blacklist of the UK, where the contest organizer is based.

Tesco-Lotus junction claims another victim

WICHIT: The Tesco-Lotus junction, officially dubbed the "Samkong Intersection", claimed another victim early on June 12, when a man riding a motorbike through the junction and a Toyota Hilux Vigo collided at high speed.

The motorbike rider died at the scene. His passenger suffered serious injuries.

Pol Lt Akekarat Plaiduang, duty inspector at Phuket Police Station, identified the deceased as Manas Surat, 17. "Piya Arddhumma, 18, who was riding pillion, sustained serious injuries," he said.

"Both are from Sakhon Nakhon and came to live in Phuket and work as security guards," he added, the driver of the Toyota Hilux Vigo, which still has red [new registration] license plates," Lt Akekarat said.

He added that criminal charges have yet to be made. "We still don't know who was in the wrong. We are checking the CCTV recording taken at the intersection," he said.

Pol Maj Teerawat Leamsuwan, of the Phuket City Police Traffic Division, said that most accidents at the Tesco-Lotus involved motorists speeding through the intersection, even though the traffic lights are now operating 24 hours.

"Even in the early morning, as in this incident, when there are few drivers on the roads, drivers must drive carefully and slow down at intersections," he added.

Two people died and five were injured when a Kusoldharm Volunteer Rescue Foundation truck rushing four accident victims to hospital collided with a Toyota sedan at high speed at the Tesco-Lotus intersection just before dawn on May 6.

PPHO warns of wet season sickness

PHUKET: The Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) on June 18 issued a warning for people to be wary of five types of aliments that are more prevalent during the rainy season, which is now upon us.

PPHO officer Arunee Suphanam warned people to take better care to avoid contracting diarrhea, infections in open wounds, colds and pneumonia, mosquito-borne diseases and conjunctivitis.

K. Arunee also warned against diseases transmitted by mosquitoes, such as dengue fever, Japanese Encephalitis (JE virus) and malaria.

"In the first five months of this year, 81 people in Phuket caught dengue fever. One person died from it. Thalang District has had the highest incidence in Phuket," K. Arunee said.

fter hearing about an underwater fight between a Thai diver and a foreign diver during which a knife was allegedly used threateningly, Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit on June 12 called a high-level meeting of his three vice-governors, the local office of the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT), the Phuket Professional Guide Association, the Thai Diving Association (TDA), the Phuket Tourist Police, the Phuket Tourist Association (PTA) and Phuket Immigration Department.

The first priority of the meeting was to uncover what had happened between the two divers at the popular dive site Richelieu Rock at the Similan Islands.

The Thai diver was Vinij Rungpheung, who writes the tourism column for the popular Thai website Manager Online. K. Vinij included his version of the incident in his column "Don't let farang rule the Andaman" posted online May 8.

In his article online, K. Vinij said he was waiting quietly to take photos of clown fish. "While I was waiting quietly for my shot, I suddenly felt a jerk on my BCD [buoyancy compensation device] from behind. At first, I thought it was my friend signaling me that he had found something nice.

"Instead, I turned to face a farang with an angry face, pointing his finger at me and then back to his head. It seemed like he was ordering me to leave clown fish alley right away, and was telling me 'use your brain to think about what you're doing'.

"I looked around myself again to see if I was touching coral, causing any damage or disturbing the fish too much. I knew exactly what I was doing. I was kneeling on sand bottom. Both of my hands on my camera, not touching anything at all...

"After checking that there was nothing wrong, I stared back at the bullying farang, and waved

him off, indicating that I had to get back to work...

"Then he threatened to cut my air hose and hurt me if I didn't get up. The water was a chilling 25 degrees Celsius, but my rage was boiling. That shiny blade swerving around my throat was boiled down to a toothpick by my rage. I tried to control my rushing anger caused by him looking down at me like that. I give him my coldest stare, and waved him off with indifference again, like I was saying, 'Keep that shoved up your butt, I'm not afraid.'

"When he was unsuccessful in pulling me away, and I wasn't afraid by his knife, he couldn't think of what else to do. He put his knife back in its sheath. Well, maybe because he didn't know what else to do, he swept his hand over my mask (and dislodged it from its place-translator), then swam away."

K. Vinij's report goes on to

explain that when he surfaced, he and his friends went to Mr Hormann's dive boat to discuss the matter. "The farang sat with his head hung low, stumbling while trying to explain that he dove in Thailand five years ago and it was beautiful. But this time the condition was worse so he was frustrated, and acted stupidly. He was sorry for his actions.

"Being Thai, with compassion in our hearts, we were calmed because the culprit had confessed and admitted his guilt. We reprimanded him and warned him not to do it again to anyone, especially to Thai divers," the report said.

"I have not pressed charges, I just want to him to be warned about his threatening reaction, which is illegal and compromises underwater safety," K.

Vinij told the *Gazette*.

"Many foreign dive leaders bring divers and always behave like this, and want to show off to their group. This happens many times, it's not just this time. Many Thai divers have had similar experiences with foreign dive leaders," he said.

Guenter Hormann, the foreigner involved in the incident, has over 6,000 dives over 25 years to his record. He explained his version of events to the *Gazette*. "I was with a group of registered divers and we had nearly finished our dive. I saw a diver alone on the bottom, which was very unusual because normally diving alone is not allowed, and he looked like he was struggling.


"I pointed him out to my divers, which is normal dive procedure. I thought the man had a problem, I told my group to wait and I went down.


"But then I saw he didn't need any help. He was in the middle of coral and breaking it. He was paddling to keep still and his fins were hitting the coral. So I put my hand under his elbow and tried to lift him up."

K. Vinij then waved Mr Hormann to leave him alone, which sparked a reaction. "I overreacted and tried to remove his mask," Mr Hormann told the *Gazette*.

As for the knife, Mr Hormann told the *Gazette*, "At first I thought he was caught up in fishing line, but then I saw he wasn't so I put it away."

Mr Hormann confirmed that the dive association PADI had been notified of the incident and that he had written an apol-

ogy to K. Vinij.

"I overreacted and what I did was wrong, and that's why I had to apologize. PADI didn't withdraw my license because it's my personal behavior. I am not an instructor or divemaster. I tried to protect the environment. I had no function on the boat. I was on holiday," he said.

However, at the time of the incident, Mr Hormann was a shareholder in Patong-based Water World Asia, which organized the tour that he was diving with on the day of the incident. Mr Hormann has confirmed that he is no longer a shareholder in the company.

At the June 12 meeting Gov Niran said that the government had no matter of recourse in regulating such individual behavior, which he says can be damaging to Phuket's dive industry. So now he is advocating that the TAT call in the Ministry of Education and set up a system of individually licensing divers working in Phuket's dive industry.

As an immediate measure, Gov Niran called on the TAT to sweep through the dive industry and weed out any operators not complying with the regulations introduced last year. "The new regulations might affect business owners, but we need them," he said.

Whether the TAT will – or can – follow this directive remains to be seen. Phuket's dive industry last year succeeded in staving off the regulations brought into effect October 1 last year.

Under the regulations, all dive operators would register by presenting the company's registration documents and tax information, the work permits of foreign staff, all boat registration documents including the names of captains and crew members, records of salaries and wages, details of any related website, the company's payment systems, diving courses and students.

Dive businesses that would have been granted permission to operate from the province would also have to submit monthly reports giving details of income, current staff and dive trips made.

Businesses that failed to submit reports, or were deemed

to have submitted inadequate reports, would have risked having their permission to operate withdrawn

However, whether the provincial government has the power to introduce such regulations is still being fought in the Administrative Court in Nakhon Sri Thammarat. The TDA is representing about 60 dive operators in Phuket who lodged a petition with the court.

On October 30 last year the court ruled that dive operators were not obliged to comply with the new regulations until the court had reached a decision, which it has yet to do.

So now focus has turned to

trying to introduce compulsory licensing for each diver working in Thailand. However, diver operators are issued licenses by organizations outside Thailand. "How can we regulate those licenses? Most of them are issued abroad," said Gov Niran.

TAT officer Rattinan Chanchanakoset said, "We do not have our own diving standard that is recognized by the international diving community. The TDA has been offering CMAS [Confé dé ration Mondiale des Activité s Subaquatiques] qualifications for three years now, but Thai law does not stipulate that all dive company employees must be members, so any qualifications

are acceptable for a dive business to get a TAT license."

PTA Vice-President Panu Maswongsa, explained, "The problem is that one foreigner holding instructor or divemaster qualifications can register the company and operate the business, but the rest of the employees we have no control over, such as fellow foreign divemasters working with the company.

"This is the gap that we have found. And we have no control over whether or not they are issued a work permit," he said.

Governor Niran said, "The TAT needs to plan the process for revoking a license. If we allow just any people to work, problems will be beyond control. There must be criteria for qualification."

He suggested that the TAT work closer with Employment Office and perhaps use the Ministry of Education's system for checking foreign teachers.

He also said that a committee should be formed soon to brainstorm ways to deal with the issue.

"There is no coordination. The Ministry of Education should be charged with checking whether a person has a valid dive instructor permit.

"If the qualifications claimed are found to be false, then there must be a committee to review the claim and revoke the license

"The TAT must research this and propose a solution to the TAT executive board, who should seriously consider this issue," he said.

The case for wearing stout underwear

NAKHON RATCHASIMA: A man was admitted to Bua Yai Hospital on June 7 with complaints of abdominal pains, which he said were caused by a leech that crawled up inside his anus while he was trying to catch fish for his wife's dinner.

Nong Chingpho, 43, told doctors that he had intermittent stomach pains for about a month, ever since his wife saw a leech crawl into his bottom. He tried taking anti-worm pills, but the pains persisted and he sometimes noticed blood in his feces, he told doctors.

Doctors at the hospital X-rayed K. Nong, but found nothing out of the ordinary. To be on the safe side, they decided to keep him in overnight for observation and to arrange for him to be X-rayed again at Maharaj Nakhon Ratchasima Hospital, which has more advanced X-ray equipment.

K. Nong explained that on May 16 his wife said she wanted fish for dinner, so he went to try and catch some at a pond nearby railway tracks in Namcharoen Village.

After a while, he began to feet itchy. Coming out of the water, he noticed a number of leeches clinging to his body. He pulled the bloodsuckers off and got back in the water, determined to catch a fish. But not long after he did, he felt an itch around his anus and again got out of the water, K. Nong said.

Waiting by the side of the pond was his wife Aphinya, 40. He asked her to have a look to see what was causing his discomfort.

She pulled down his shorts

– he was wearing no underpants

– and was shocked to see the tail
end of a leech, at least three cen-

timeters long, hanging out from his anus.

K. Aphinya grabbed the leech and tried to pull it out, but could not get a firm grip on its slimy exterior. When her fingers slipped off its body, the leech worked its way well up into K. Nong's bottom, he said.

When he returned home he took anti-parasite medication, but was still not sure if the leech had died or not.

A few days later, he developed a stomach ache that persisted, on and off, until eventually he decided he should see a doctor to find out if the leech was to blame.

"I want to warn anyone who goes swimming to wear tight-fitting underpants as a leech could crawl into your bottom or genitals and you'll end up with the same problem as me," K. Nong said.

"Now I always feel uncomfortable and sometimes there is blood in my feces," he added.


Dr Chanon Chaodamrongsakul, Director of Bua Yai Hospital, repeated K. Nong's warning that anyone swimming in freshwater ponds of lakes should wear tight-fitting undies. A leech entering a woman's sexual organs could be particularly dangerous, he noted.

Doctors treating K. Nong would first have to determine whether the leech was still inside him and, if so, where exactly it was, Dr Chanon added.

They would then have to find a way to remove it, he continued, possibly using a scope and tweezers. If the leech was in a position that could not be reached by a scope and tweezers, they may he have to operate.

Egat plans nuclear power plants

he Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand (Egat) is ready to invest over US\$ 6 billion (208 billion baht) in building two nuclear power plants to generate a combined 4,000 megawatts (MW) of nuclear power.

Egat Governor Kraisri Karnasutra said that the investment required is significantly cheaper than that for coal-fired plants.

"We're studying the project in detail, and we'll also work on educating the public about nuclear power generation," K. Kraisri told an Egat-sponsored forum entitled "Why Nuclear Power Plants?"

The plants, to be located near rivers for cooling purposes, would cover an area of 1,000-2,000 rai, he said.

Energy Minister Piyasvasti Amranand told the forum that Thailand needs nuclear power because it is over-reliant on natural gas, one-third of which comes from Burma.

Energy ministers of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (Apec) forum at a meeting in Australia in May approved jointly developing nuclear power technology, he said.

Under the Egat plan, 4,000 MW of nuclear power is set to supplement the Thai national power grid within the next 14 years: 2,000MW to be added in 2020 and 2,000MW in 2021.

A working committee on nuclear power has been formed and an action plan should be complete by the end of this year, K. Piyasvasti said.

If approved, construction of the plants will not start before 2014, by which time the authorities will have undertaken personnel training and public education.

A further assessment will then be carried out to finalize whether Thailand was ready for nuclear power plants. If so, the plants will take about six years to build.

Holy cookies: Amid Thailand's Jatukham Ramathep craze, the abbot of Wat Suan Kaew in Nonthaburi, has launched a line of "Chatu Kham" cookies in a bid to teach people about the Lord Buddha's teachings.

Targeting Buddhists caught up in the amulet craze, Phra Payom Kalayano on June 15 revealed the Chatu Kham series of cookies, sold in cans costing 60 bobt each

One side of each cookie has Chatu Kham image imprinted on it, the other Buddhist teachings written in Sanskrit.

Questioning the craze of the Jatukham talisman, and noting it was not exactly compatible with the essence of Buddhism, Phra Payom said his Chatu Kham cookies were a simple way to teach the Lord Buddha's teachings so that Thai people would be aware and refrain from getting "unreasonably attached" to material wealth.

Innocents die: Police in Lampang charged Srinuan Phromnim, 59, with premeditated murder for allegedly poisoning her two grandchildren in Sop Prap District

- in order to collect insurance payouts worth 200,000 baht so she could pay off debts.

On June 5, Kwanpetch Sudthes, 11, and Kwanmanee Sudthes, 10, suffered fatal symptoms of poisoning while riding bicycles to shop for their grandmother Srinuan.

Kwanpetch died at the scene, while his sister went into a coma and later succumbed to organ failure. She died the next day.

The Lampang Centre Hospital's autopsy reports later revealed the children's stomachs contained traces of pesticide.

Police discovered Srinuan was the beneficiary of payouts after two previous poisoning deaths in the family, her husband in 2004 and another grandchild earlier this year.

Srinuan denied the charges and said she would fight the accusations in court.

Poorest province: Samut Prakan province has the highest average annual income per capita in provinces outside Bangkok, while Mae Hong Son has the poorest, according to a survey by the Interior Ministry's Community Development Department.

The survey found that the average annual income in Samut Prakan was 65,966 baht a year, more than twice the average of 30,230 baht in Mae Hong Son.

Pathum Thani ranked second, with an average annual income of 65,229 baht, followed by Chanthaburi (64,176 baht), Nonthaburi (57,843 baht) and Kamphaeng Phet (56,442).

Jarupong Poldej, the department's deputy director-general, said that the high level of income in Samut Prakan was due to its proximity to Bangkok, advanced infrastructure that supported business and jobs, and each household having two to three income earners.

Mae Hong Son, in contrast, was a mountainous area with a large proportion of minorities, such as hilltribes doing agricultural work.

Erosion toll: Coastal erosion is biting two square kilometers of land off Thailand every year, according to a report issued by the World Bank.

The World Bank's Jitendra Jha said Thailand's coastal environment has suffered adverse impacts from populations and activities along the coast of Thailand increasing over the past several decades.

With increased sea-fishery activities and shrimp farms, about 80% of coral reefs in the Andaman Sea and 50% in the Gulf of Thailand have been deteriorating.

Construction of piers, dams and digging for artesian water

also aggravated the erosion, he

Natural Resource and Environment Ministry Director-General Nisakorn Kositrat said her ministry would begin surveying coastal areas in five provinces bordering the Gulf of Thailand.

"If any structure is found to have caused erosion, it will be improved," she said. Nisakorn vowed to remove structures that cannot be improved if their existence meant erosion would become worse.

A bill on the promotion of marine and coastal resource management, when enforced, would allow coastal communities' participation in the management, she added.

The Council of State is reviewing the bill, which has already been approved by the Cabinet.

Hemp for highlanders? Following a suggestion by HM Queen Sirikit, highlanders are hoping to grow hemp from which they will make durable clothes to sell.

Mom Chao Bhisatej Rajani, President of the Royal Project Foundation, said industrial hemp had the potential to be a valuable cash crop – if it can be grown legally.

Currently, hemp with tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) levels of more than 0.3% is banned as the illegal drug cannabis under the Narcotics Act of 1979.

The Royal Project Foundation is looking to develop hemp strains containing low levels of THC to comply with the law ahead of seeking permission for legal cultivation.

Fashioning a new beginning







Inmates create items like wicker end tables, night stands and patio furniture to sell at their annual fair, from June 28 to July 7 this year.

he 4th Annual Prison Products Exhibition for Southern Thailand, featuring products made by inmates at the 25 correctional facilities throughout the 14 southern provinces, will be on show at Saphan Hin this year from June 28 to July 7.

The fair will open from 10 am to 9 pm daily, with a grand opening ceremony starting at 6 pm on June 28 featuring performances by local singers and food stalls from 80 restaurants around Phuket.

This is the fourth consecutive year the fair has been held.

The inmates who make the furniture get to keep some of the profits made from the sale of the furniture they create – money that they can put aside for when they are released back into society.

For many prisoners taking part in the project, the sale of their hand-fashioned products can help provide the confidence they will need to help them pursue their dreams in life after prison – without resorting to crime.

Phuket Provincial Prison Director Paisal Suwanraksa told the *Gazette*, "We would like to

show people the skills that the prisoners have learned, and we want to help further develop those skills in production and design.

"Most importantly, we want

"Most importantly, we want to change their behavior before they leave here and return to society."

Prisoners receive 50% of net income made on the products sold, he said.

"They can keep this money to use while they are in prison or they can give it to their families," he said.

"Our prisoners invest a lot of effort in their work, putting their all into every piece that they create. If you visit the fair, you will see that every unit of furniture shows how hard they have worked," K. Paisal said.

"After they leave here, they will be able to use all the skills that they have learned in making furniture. We believe that they have the capability," he added.

"All prison officials and current inmates hope that people will welcome prisoners back into society, because most prisoners are not bad guys. They might have been blind to their mistakes. When they are released we believe that they are ready to return to normal lives," K. Paisal said.

On sale at the fair will be furniture such as sofas, wardrobes, beds and tables made from a variety of materials, including wood, iron, marble and rattan.

A wide range of styles is available, including traditional Thai and many unique design concepts developed by the inmates themselves.

Last year's fair garnered six million baht in sales. Event organizers hope to make more this year.

Bandito to finally get day in court

he high-profile case against long-time Samui expat resident Crispin Paton-Smith moved a step forward this week with a court date finally set for the end of August.

Paton-Smith, a former member of the British Army, was arrested last July in Pattaya in one of the biggest media-covered arrests in recent years.

Along with two other expats living on Samui charged in the same case, Paton-Smith was accused of a long list of offenses, including being officers in a secret society, attempted murder, money laundering, extortion, drug trafficking, human trafficking, racketeering, prostitution, bribing government officials, illegal land sales and transfers, rape, fraud and illegal weapons trading.

Charges against the other

two expats have since been dropped, but in a court hearing on June 5 the trial date in Paton-Smith's case was delivered and the original list of allegations against him was reduced to two charges: forming a secret society with intent to make criminal activity and attempted extortion.

The two charges are in relation to Paton-Smith's involvement with well-known international biker gang

the Banditos. The Thai government has been working in conjunction with Danish officials who claim that the gang has been involved with serious criminal activities in other parts of the globe.

The attempted extortion charge is said to be due to business dealings gone bad with other gang members also living on Samui.

Paton-Smith had been living on Samui for 13 years with his wife and child before his arrest and was the owner of a successful diving operation on the island as well as a popular publishing company.

The widespread media cov-

erage of his arrest, along with the other two expats and four Thai nationals from the island, shocked the community and led to further investigations of possible illegal land dealing and other suspicious activities involving land offices.

Accusations were made against some of the men that land was being illegally obtained and sold on the island.

Paton-Smith has a number of supporters and a website has been set up to gather further backers demanding for justice to be served and for his release from Bangkok's Special Remand Prison on the grounds that his remaining two charges are usually bail permitting.

"This court hearing has been a step forward in regards to the legal proceedings in this case, which has had many setbacks and hearings without a trial date be-

ing assigned in his case," said one of the attendees of the court hearing.

A total of 57 people are expected to testify in the case from August 27 to November 2.

One swung low: Korean Lee Sung beat local hotshot Prayad Marksaeng by just three strokes to win the third annual Bangkok Airways Open at the Santiburi Samui Country Club from June 7 to 10.

Lee lifted the tourney trophy and collected the top prize of US\$ 47,550 (1.55 million baht) of the US\$ 300,000 (about 9.79 million baht) prize purse in his first win on the Asian Tour golf circuit

Lee, who was born deaf, turned pro in 2000 and played with the support of his brother and caddy Lee Sung-joo, who he communicates with by lip reading.

"I'm quite happy and will definitely call my dad [Lee Kengkun]. My dad usually caddies for me but he is tired and decided to rest this week," said Lee.


The par 71 golf course saw heated competition from many high-ranking Western and Asian competitors. Seoul-born Lee scored a course record 62 in the third round and completed the tourney with a 16-under-par 268.

Prayad finished three strokes behind in second place and Thai youngster Priom Meesawa finished in third place tied with Taichiro Kiyota from Japan.



Teachers targeted in Deep South

early 100 public schools in Narathiwat province were closed for a week after three teachers were shot dead in Si Sakhon and Rangae districts June 11. Following the attacks, two Islamic teachers were shot dead in Yala and Songkhla provinces.

In the first attack, about midday, two men riding as pillion passengers on a motorbike arrived and walked straight into the library of Baan Sakoh School where Thippaporn Thassanopas, 42, and Yupha Sengwas, 26, were working.

The men fired 11mm and .357 pistols as some 100 children played in front of the library. Both women died at the scene.

About an hour later, a male teacher was shot dead in a shop in Rangae district. So-mai Laocharoensuk, 55, a teacher at Baan Jehke School, was hit six times in the head and body by AK-47 fire. A witness said that one of a group of six militants carried the rifle into the shop and opened fire on the teacher.

That evening, Da-oh Mundai-che, 42, an Islamic teacher, was shot dead as he walked to a store in his village in Songkhla's Saba Yoi District.

Two days later, on June 13, gunmen shot dead Abdulrahman Sama, 60, an Islamic teacher at a village *pondok*, or traditional Islamic boarding school, in Yala's Raman District.

Narathiwat police have arrested one man for his involvement in the killing of K. Thippaporn and K. Yupha. A police source reported that Maleepeng Che-leh, 19, confessed to being involved in the murder but maintained that his role was to drive the two killers to and from the crime scene.

On June 15 in Yala's Banang Sata district, seven soldiers on teacher security detail were killed in an ambush on their truck. Suspected insurgents detonated a roadside explosive device that disabled the truck. The assailants

then sprayed the survivors with automatic weapons fire.

The attackers then made off with the soldiers' M-16 assault rifles.

Official exit: A government official and a female friend of his were found shot dead in the car park of Surat Thani Provincial Hall June 15 in what police believe to be a murder-suicide.

Police led by Surat Thani Muang District Police Superintendent Col Attaphon Plengwiitthaya found the body of Chanchai Phromhan, an Administrative Officer (*Palad*) attached to the Provincial Fight to Gain Victory Over Drugs program, dead in the driver's seat of his car.

Next to him was the body of Suphap Judabut, 19, who had been shot once in the head and twice in the body.

Chanchai had been shot once in the temple. A 9mm pistol was found next to his body.

A colleague of Chanchai

reportedly told police that about 2 pm that day Chanchai took the pistol he had just bought out of his desk draw and told a close friend to ring his parents in Chiang Rai province and ask them to come and get his body.

He then ran down to his car and started shooting, the colleague told police.

The same colleague also reported that Chanchai and K. Suphap, who worked as a singer in a restaurant in Surat Thani, had been associating for some time before the incident and that Chanchai was already married with children.

Dam mystery: The motive for the killing of prominent Chumphon environmental activist Mai Noinarai, 49, who was shot dead June 7, is still unclear with the victim's wife insisting that K. Mai's death is connected to his work opposing the construction of a dam while police are focusing on a personal dispute.

K. Mai was shot on the evening of June 7 as he was riding his motorcycle back from a meeting to discuss how to oppose the building of a dam in Chumphon's Tha Sae district by the Irrigation Department. After being shot, K. Mai managed to carry on driving his motorbike to his brother's house, where he fell off.

K. Mai's brother, Thuan, 40, said that about 9:30 pm he heard a motorbike crash outside his house. He rushed out and found his brother lying on the ground and covered in blood, and shouting that he had been shot. K. Thuan rushed his brother to Tha Sae Hospital, where doctors operated on him for five hours but were unable to save his life.

K. Thuan said that before K. Mai died, he had told him that he had been driving through a coffee plantation when a pickup truck pulled up beside him and the passenger shot him twice with a short shotgun.

K. Mai escaped by turning

off onto a small trail through the plantation where the truck could not follow, K. Thuan said.

K. Mai's wife, Bunchoo Noinarai, 40, said that she was confident that the motive for her husband's killing stemmed from his opposition to the Tha Sae dam project.

His activities had brought him into conflict with influential investors who had bought land earmarked for use in the project with the hope of gaining lucrative compensation from the government.

K. Mai had received many death threats from these groups, she added.


Head of Salui Tambon Police Station, Lt Col Suthep Korsakul, however, said the case was not so clear. He said that K. Mai was close to a former Democrat Party Member of Parliament and a Deputy President of Chumphon Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) and K. Mai himself was a member of Song Phee Nong Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*), all of which could have provided motives for his killing.

Wiran Chuklang, a member of Chumphon *OrBorJor*, said that K. Mai was liked by many villagers for his work but had also made a lot of enemies. Apart from owning a rubber and coffee plantation, K. Mai worked as a moneylender and ran a school bus service, K. Wiran added.

Chumphon Provincial Police Commander Maj Gen Wisan Plenkham said that police, after questioning a number of witnesses, now believe that a personal dispute and not K. Mai's environmental activities to be the cause for the killing.


Police are also fairly certain that the gunman was a local man with a grudge against K. Mai rather than a hired killer, Gen Wisan added.

eaders of the Gazette by now might have noticed that not many restaurants serving "farang" food have been featured in this column.

The truth is that most restaurants that do farang food well simply don't qualify, as we use a 100-baht per dish maximum as our rule-of-thumb on what qualifies as a "cheap eat".

Of course, in the under-100baht price range there are many restaurants in Phuket serving sickeningly sweet spaghetti, baked goods with the texture of pillow stuffing or pizza served with ketchup as a necessary condiment. The truth is that while Thais do Thai food well, they tend to struggle with Western fare – at least in this price range.

That's why P Pizza House on Yaowarat Rd in Samkong, Phuket City, is a real find, because it offers the quality of food one might expect from a restaurant in a four- or five-star hotel, but at prices just about everyone can afford – even a journalist.

Opened in early April this year and still with just two staff - Amporn "Porn" Krasang and his wife Phakaphan – P Pizza House is very much a family-run business. K. Porn has 14 years' experience in the food and beverage industry in Phuket, having worked at The Metropole, Le Royal Meridien Phuket Yacht Club, Patong Merlin and the Sheraton Grande Laguna, where he was a Chef de Partie.

K. Porn's hotel experience shows in every phase, from the design and spacing of the restaurant's eight tables and the attractive dishes and sturdy cutlery, right down to the food itself.

Most restaurants in this

price range don't even have an English-language menu, but the one here is not only easy to read, but accurately translated – so you can ponder over a wide

variety of mouthwatering choices that don't include the funny yet nausea-inducing options – such as "paper steak" or "deep fried crap roll" – that defile so many menus in Phuket.

The most expensive items on the menu, at 100 baht, are grilled salmon steak and sirloin steak. Thai staples such as fried rice and raad na are just 25 baht,

no more than at a sidewalk stall. This is a real bargain when you consider that the dining area is airy and comfortable, despite being right on a congested stretch of Yaowarat Rd near Samkong Shrine, a center of activity for the annual Vegetarian Festival.

To start up his restaurant, K. Amporn invested in a new 30,000-baht pizza oven. There are about 10 pizza options, starting at just 40 baht for a plain 10-inch tomato and cheese pizza. There are no ridiculous Thai hybrids such as tom yum gung or green curry pizzas on the menu.

Vegetable toppings are five baht each, while meats and seafood are 10 baht. I am pretty careful about ordering pizza in this country, so I decided to build my own with onions, a mix of green, red and yellow capsicum, sau-

sage, salami, a black olives and mushrooms. A total of 85

I also ordered a "weightwatcher salad" at 35 baht, wondering with trep-

idation what to expect – as Western-style salads served by small Thai restaurants are all too often

I was pleasantly surprised with the salad, which contained fresh iceberg lettuce, small cherry tomatoes, sliced grapes and cubes of pineapple and apple. Everything was fresh; the whole salad was sprinkled with minute-

ly diced capsicum and garnished with thee fresh slices of orange.

The dressing was a tangy mix of salad oil, red and balsamic vinegar and fine-chopped onions.

Refreshing and light, it was the perfect appetizer and left me wondering: with such an abundance and variety of fruit in this country, why is it so hard to find good, cheap fruit salads?

All pizza pies at P Pizza are of the thin-crust variety, though not so crispy that they break apart at first bite. The pizza itself had just the right amount of tomato sauce and cheese to let the toppings stand out, and these were all fresh and evenly distributed across the surface.

Notably, the tomato sauce was not too sweet, and the cheese was not that glutinous industrial goo you see on too many by-the-slice pizzas available at shopping malls on the island.

Perhaps the only letdown of my meal was the fact that I could only look longingly at the small cans of Heineken (35 baht) lined up behind the frost in the large glass door refrigerator, each seeming to call out "Why have you forsaken me?"


Sadly it was lunchtime; I try to hold off until the sun goes down before hitting the cool ones.

Asked about the name of the restaurant, K. Porn explained it was chosen because he, his wife and their young son all have names with the letter "P" in them. Reasonable enough.

Things I would like to try on future visits include the grilled saba fish (70 baht), pork chops (70 baht) and sea bass fillet "meuniere" (70 baht). That next visit will likely come

soon, as this restaurant is walking distance from my house and is an excellent vantage point for one of my favorite leisure activities – watching traffic pass while drinking beer with like-minded friends.



Soi Dog Foundation

On February 13, 21-year-old masseuse Saijai Phromdaen was set on fire by a mentally unstable man and known paint-thinner sniffer at Patong's Loma Park. After two months at Vachira Phuket Hospital, where she underwent multiple skin graft surgeries and treatments, K. Saijai recently returned to work at the beach.

K. Saijai spoke to *Gazette* reporter **Supanun** Supawong about her ongoing recovery, both physical and mental, and thanked all the Gazette readers who donated to the Saijai Aid fund set up for her by Dr Jerry Hoss.

lmost two months af ter her release from Vachira Hospital, K. ►Saijai took a big step forward in her recovery a few weeks ago by returning to work, though it is something she is doing more out of economic necessity than as a therapeutic measure.

Surveying her badly scarred forearms and knowing that her face suffered even worse disfigurement, she is left to wonder if she will ever regain a semblance of her old appearance. At the same time, she is grateful for the comfort and support she has received throughout the ordeal, both from her husband and family as well as many kind-hearted strangers who have contributed to Saijai Aid.

"Even though I left Vachira Hospital about two months ago, I still suffer pain and itching where I am scarred on my arms and face. It doesn't hurt much when

I shower, but I get a painful stinging sensation and swelling from exposure to sunlight.

"Doc-

explained.

"I also feel pain in my lips when speaking and I have to avoid opening my mouth wide," she said.

K. Saijai suffers some kind of pain most of the day, and at not hold my daughter for too long or my arms start to swell. When I am asleep, I feel pain if I try to turn and sleep curled up," she said.

However, being able to hold her daughter Sairung "Ice" Tharnsaeng is a big step forward. The playful two-year-old, who witnessed the attack, was terrified at the sight of her mom after the incident.

"My daughter is used to my condition now. The situation is a lot better than when I was in hospital. At first she cried every time she saw me and she was afraid to come near, but now she is ok,"

Before doctors released her, they told K. Saijai that she would remain scarred for life and that there were no medications that could reverse the loss of skin she suffered from her severe burns. Nevertheless, she continues to buy scar-reducing salves and skin nourishing creams from pharma-


cies in the hopes of returning her appearance as much as possible to what it once

"The doctors told me to come back in six months if there wasn't any further improvement, but they didn't

schedule an appointment," she

"I worry about my face the most, because now I have bright scars, which cause people to stare at me. This makes me feel selfconscious so I don't want to go out in public, but I have no choice

"My mother always comforts me and provides support, which gives me the strength to go out and face the world," she said.

K. Saijai said the attack on her by 43-year-old Chumphon native Sombun Kaewkhaaw has left her in fear of mentally ill people. "I can still remember it like it happened yesterday and it still scares me," she said.

"An investigator with the Kathu Police questioned me after I left the hospital. I was told

that it would be difficult to prosecute the man who did this to me because he was diagnosed as insane at Suan Saranrom Psychiatric Hospital. They said he was suffering from paranoia.

"No relatives came to claim him or look after him. Perhaps they feared they would be held responsible for my treatment costs if they did. The last I heard, he was being held in a cell at Phuket Provincial Court," said K. Saijai.

Asked about her hopes for the future, K. Saiji said she hoped

kindhearted people would continue to donate enough for her to get the expensive surgery procedures she needs to give her a more normal appearance and reduce facial pain.

"I want to get better so I can work and save up enough money to send my daughter to daycare, where she can start learning with other kids her own age. Right now my husband and I cannot afford that, so she stays with us all day. My husband is working, but his salary is low. My

mother helps us as well.

"I received 5,000 baht in assistance money from the Red Cross Society, along with help from others who know me and kindhearted readers of the *Phuket Gazette* who donated money [through Saijai Aid] and brought me food. I really want to thank everybody who helped me for all their kind support," she said.

K. Saijai said her husband, who is 22, has thus far been loyal to her despite her disfigurement, but that she worries whether or not the commitment will continue. "If my face stays like this, I don't know how long my husband can stay with me," she said.

"He works as a dishwasher at a hotel in Kata, where he makes 5,700 baht per month. We have lived together for five years, at my parents house in Chalong, where we are raising our daughter.

"My husband is still as good to me as ever, standing by me, taking care of me and lending moral support. He has asked me if my face will ever return to normal. I tell him I don't know. However, I do know that he feels embarrassed among his friends that his wife looks like this.

"I sense that he is afraid to take me out in public, but I don't feel angry or neglected about it. I understand that it's normal behavior. However, I'm not sure how long he can live with me in this condition and this worries me."

"I used to make about 1,000 baht a day giving massages in the high season, but I had to save money in order to cover all my expenses during the low season, which includes milk money and insurance for my daughter and sharing water and electricity bills

with my parents.

"But this has changed my life completely. Although I am finally back to work, there are few tourists around now because it is the low season and I lose a lot of work because of all the rain. What savings I do have I end up spending on the creams and ointments I need for my wounds. My parents help me with this too, which means we don't have enough to get my daughter into a daycare program.

"Sometimes I break down and cry when I think about how this terrible misfortune has happened to me. I often feel sad and dejected, but I am lucky that I have good parents and a husband who has stood by me. They always tell me my face will get better. Now I still think I have a 50% chance of having my face return to normal. I hope that it does, so that when I go to work people won't stare at me like I am strange," she said.

K. Saijai's typical daily routine these days involves getting up early and doing housework until about 10 am, then she goes to Patong to work – weather permitting.

mitting.

"Sometimes it hurts me to massage my customers; I can't give a hard massage like I used to. I have had only two customers since going back to work a few weeks ago. They haven't seemed afraid of me, but curious as to what happened. When I explained, they felt sympathy for me and gave me nice tips," she said.

anything for what happened to me. I think it is just my own misfortune and I have to deal with it as best I can. I know I have to take care of my health and stay as strong as possible. I hope nothing bad like this ever happens to me again. I hope that my appearance improves close to what it was before and that I can work as hard as I used to."

here is always something slightly strange about driving an automatic version of an already highly-successful manual car.

Will it be in any way diluted? Will it lose performance in "power losses" due to the necessary torque converter? Or will the manufacturer manage to disguise its shortcomings in a new package?

As far as the new Quattroporte Automatic is concerned, none of the above is true – or even relevant. It is without doubt an amazing motor car: a sports car with all the amenities and convenience of a luxury saloon.

Make no mistake, the Quattroporte is a big car, along the lines of an S-Class or an Audi, but its sporting instincts place it in a class of its own. The gearbox is a ZF automatic – not the F1-style Magneti Marelli unit found in the Ferrari 430 or the 360 – but a fully automatic unit. It does, however, have steering wheel manual control paddles if desired.

When using the paddles with the system in sport mode, the performance is simply outstanding. With a top speed approaching 270kmh and a benchmark sprint time from standstill to 100kmh of under six seconds, there are few four-door saloons that can match the Quattroporte Automatic.


To rein in this performance, massive ventilated discs are fitted, resulting in a stopping distance from a speed of 100kmh of just 35 meters.

The power plant is Maserati's lightweight 4,244cc, 32-valve V8, delivering a healthy 400bhp (294kW) with a strong torque output of 460Nm produced at the relatively low engine speed of 4,250rpm. More significantly, around 75% of the available torque is produced at 2,500rpm.

The new six-speed ZF transmission is mated to the rear of the V8 engine, unlike the standard Quattroporte on which it is part of the rear transaxle. The result is a subtle alteration in the front-to-rear weight distribution, which is now an almost perfect 49:51, still offering the slight rear bias necessary on a large rear-drive car.

The interior of the new model is typical Maserati: luxury and style combined with classic lines and functionality. The dashboard centerpiece is the familiar trident oval clock, while the tachometer and speedometer are tastefully finished and of a sensible size; no massive tachometer as if to draw attention to the engine speed.

There are nine interior color options and five choices of wood veneer, including rose-



wood, walnut, mahogany, black piano and an obscure option called Tanganyika. The roof lining is a supple Alcantara, while the seats are sumptuous leather.

A complement of air bags is fitted, including side bags, while there are five headrests and a full set of lap-and-diagonal seat belts. Rear-seat passengers have their own climate controls, while the automatic air conditioning can be individually set for each front-seat occupant.

The styling of the Quattroporte by the legendary Turin-based Pininfarina design house has attracted a great deal of critical acclaim and it is rare for such a large car to feature such classic yet sporting lines.


Large alloy wheels and low-profile tires add to the overall impression, while the traditional Maserati grille topped by the trident emphasizes the long tradition of the marque. The trident logo, borrowed from their home town of Bologna, was adopted by the Maserati brothers when the company was formed in 1926.

The latest Quattroporte Automatic is the ultimate in luxury, but with its superb performance it can be rightly described as a sports model with the convenience of a sedan. A high-performance machine with all the amenities and an outstanding example of automotive brilliance from Maserati.



Wet weather eye for beauty

efore heading out to work or for a night on the town, women across Phuket dab their eyes and faces with expensive makeup in the latest fashion, but by the time they make it through a Phuket rainy-season downpour, they look like they have either been crying or trying out for a job with Barnum and Bailey.

However, by choosing the right makeup, beauty is only a cotton swab away. Warangkana Wichai, branch manager of The Body Shop at Central Festival Phuket, says that women should match the makeup with the weather.

"The trend this rainy season is soft, subtle colors such as blue and gray, which are very suitable for the office. Cosmetics with shimmer in them, making your face sparkle and look bright, are popular, too," he says.

"A popular style for eyeshadow is the 'drama trick style', which highlights your eyes. This uses a base of white and gray. On top of that use a dark layer of blue on the bottom half of the eyelids and a lighter color on the top half.

However, Ame-orn Rermpayup, general manager at Hanako Tokyo in Jungceylon, says that the popular colors this rainy season are not blue and gray, but a combination of pastels.

"The rainy season is a time to relax, so we use light, sweet colors such as pink and light green. Women still wear make-up in the rainy season, but many women wear make-up that is not appropriate. They should wear light colors.

"A light green tone eyeshadow is suitable for the rainy season because green goes well with the green trees that we see

so much during this season," K. Ame-orn says.

Layering eyeshadow colors is popular with pastels, too. Use a white highlight powder as a base and green eyeshadow on the bottom half of the eyelids, then cover with a light layer of brown eyeshadow, she recommends.

The two makeup specialists also agree that powdered cosmetics should be used instead of creams. Cream-based eyeshadow smears too easily in the wet weather, they say.

"Women with small eyes should paint more heavy-handed with the eyeshadow to help make their eyes look bigger. Paint gray on the lower half of the eyelids, then use an eyeliner pencil to highlight the eyebrow, then redraw it again with an eyeliner," K. Warangkana says.

"Women who have big eyes set far apart can correct it by painting heavily at the outside corners of the eyelids," he adds.

"Eyeliner pencils should always match the color of the hair, and solid eyebrow pencils should be used instead of liquid pencils to fill in eyebrows, as rain can make liquid pencil lines run.

"Eyebrows should be drawn within the lines of the natural eyebrows, and the end of the eyebrows should be trimmed to give them a good shape, especially as thin eyebrows are popular now.

"Then, with the pencil, draw a little longer than the end of the eyes. That will look beautiful, and top it off with mascara to make the eyelashes look longer," K. Warangkana says.

Mascara is the most obvious culprit for rainy-season woes,

and smeared lines can leave misleading signs of a broken heart. While that may inspire sympathy, looking like a panda probably isn't worth it.

K. Ame-orn says that mascara plays a big part in making a women's eyes stand out. "Under your eyes, use a dark brown eyeshadow and a shimmer to make your eyes look bigger. Then draw your eyebrows and brush your eyelashes with mascara," she says.

"Of course, use a rain-resistant mascara and choose a type of mascara that best suits your eyelashes. For example: if you have short eyelashes, use an eyelash-extending mascara; if you have thin eyelashes, use a mascara that thickens them.





s I'm approaching and entering the Cape Spa I think to myself that it looks more like an expensive, elegant villa than a spa. There is a mix of traditional Thai and modern design, high ceilings, floor-to-ceiling windows and stunning views of the bay.

Though the spa opened earlier this year, the hotel it's located in - Cape Panwa Hotel - has been a Phuket standard for 20 years.

Spa Manager Wanphen Daloonpate certainly has the credentials to set up the spa; she has experience from 16 spas over the past six years and in many of those locations she was the preopening manager and helped to design the spas and menus, train staff and get the spa off the

She said the response she has received about Cape Spa thus far has been positive, especially about the design. She says the guests love walking around the building and admiring the style and color tones. They say it makes them feel at home.

The large spa building has two levels providing four therapy rooms, three Thai massage rooms and a foot massage room.

he Cold War proved hog heaven for a German-speaking British MI6 spy. His masterpiece, The Spy Who Came in From the Cold, set in the Berlin Wall era, proved the benchmark for all spy thrillers to follow. The author, of course, was John LeCarré, who went on to pen the Smiley trilogy that encapsulated all the moral ambiguities of the Cold War.

With the fall of the Berlin Wall, Le-Carré was set adrift and floundered for a while, though The Little Drummer Girl was a masterful exposition of the Arab-Israeli conflict at the time of the Lebanese invasion. The Tailor of Panama started off great, but fizzled in the end. But now Le Carré has discovered the miseries of Africa and his well-researched The Constant Gardener took on the big pharmaceutical companies in Aids-stricken Kenya. He has followed up with The Mission Song (Little, Brown and Company, New York, 2006, 339pp). This is his 20th novel, and at age 75 he remains at the very top of his form.

This time he takes on the big mining companies lusting after the riches of the war-torn eastern Congo region of Kivu. Bruno Salvador, known as Salvo, grew up as a mission kid, son of an Irish missionary and a beautiful Congolese woman. In his youth he mastered the plethora of languages in the region: Swahili, English, French, Kanyarwanda, Lingala, Bemb and Shi. Dispatched to a Catholic boarding school in England, where he was groomed by the aristocratic Brother Michael to become a professional interpreter, he was soon recruited by the MI6 as a listener of phone conversation among various African terrorists.



"Like Michael, he is a man complete, at once tall and bearish, the features as permanent as lava stone, every movement an event. Like Michael, he is a father to his men. He is somewhere in his late fifties, you assume, yet you have no sense that he was yesterday a dashing lad, or tomorrow will be on the shelf. He is rectitude personified, he is constabular, he is the oak of England. Just crossing a room he takes the moral justification for his actions with him. You can wait an eternity for his smile, but when it comes you're closer to God."

no moral problems betraying her with a beautiful Congolese nurse named Hannah from "the region of Goma in North Kivu, by tribe a Nande". Two nights into their torrid romance, he is summoned by Mr Anderson for a secret mission to a mansion on an island in the North Sea.

Hannah regards an elderly Congolese intellectual, Mwangaza ("The Enlightened One") as the potential savior for Kivu, which has been wracked by a civil war that has cost two million lives. Mwangaza arrives on the island to meet with three local warlords to get together to seize the government of Kivu, throw out the Rwandan invaders and open the country for mining by an unnamed syndicate that will, in turn, provide arms and mercenaries. Salvo's job is to listen in to their taped conversations and report back to his handlers.

Warlord One is the noble Dieudonne, of the Munyamulenge, a pastoral tribe related to the hated Tutsi of Rwanda. Warlord Two is Honore mour-Joyeuse, a rich French-educated dandy and millionaire of the Shi tribe who will lead the urban insurrection that will spark the coup. Warlord Three is a very nasty character named Colonel Franco, an old Bembe warrior of the fanatical Mai Mai sect who believes his magic rituals will turn his enemies' bullets into water.

"And we should not be fooled by 'Colonel," Salvo notes. "We're not talking cleaned-and-pressed uniforms, saluteyour officers, red flashes, medal ribbons and the like. We're talking feathered headdresses, baseball caps, monkey-skin waistcoats, football shorts, tracksuits and eye make-up ... We are also talking random, feckless murder, rape galore, and a full range of atrocities under the influence of everything from leading-edge witchcraft to a gallon or two of Primus beer laced with palm wine."

> Salvo soon learns that the plot to liberate Kivu is a sham, concocted by a greedy consortium of mining interests. Back in England, reunited with Hannah, he desperately tries to alert the government and press to the impending catastrophe. This is the plot of the last third of the novel and it races to a surprising conclusion. At this point, there is no way you can put the book down.

The Mission Song is much more than a thriller. It is is a dense, vibrant, panoramic drama about some of the most passionate and complex moral issues of our times: the thin forces of civilization against the overwhelming powers of greed, chaos and barbarism.

A well-run race

For the second year in a row the Laguna Phuket International Marathon was a resounding success; everyone involved in the event deserves a congratulatory pat on the back.

By successfully merging public and private interests, the organizers of the marathon again brought some very positive international attention to our island.

With international media coverage, well-arranged and executed events and an increasing pool of runners, the marathon brought in just the type of publicity and quality tourists that Phuket needs.

A perennial goal for agencies such as the Phuket Provincial Administrative Organization, Tourism Authority of Thailand and Governor's Office has been to increase sports tourism in the province. In recent years they have made great strides by hosting major events including the marathon, which draws high-quality, fitnessminded tourists to Phuket.

Figures released from Laguna Phuket show that this year the marathon attracted 4,000 participants, including 1,500 runners. Among those attending were an abundance of families and even a few celebrities, including Charlie Webster and Andy Penders from ESPN.

Both were major assets to the marathon. Andy set an example by taking his family on the five-kilometer charity walk; Charlie not only finished second in her age category in the 21-km half marathon, but also led the children's run and cheered the youngsters over the finish line – a class act indeed.

The next step in bringing more people like this to Phuket is already underway in Mai Khao, where initial work on a 70-millionbaht sports complex recently began.

When completed, the facility should help groups like Team TBB, the triathlon team training on the island, and draw more international groups to enjoy Phuket's warm weather, great food and relatively low cost of living as they prepare for international sporting events.

The complex will allow Phuket to realize more of the great potential for sports tourism it so obviously holds.

The initial plan for a privately-funded sports training center was presented in January of 2006, when it received a warm response from then-Phuket Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura. Although the project has since been scaled down significantly, there is still plenty of potential for expansion in Mai Khao, where the Treasury Department controls over 2,000 rai of land.

Seeing the packed hotel rooms and smiling faces that the marathon inspired, let's hope the provincial authorities sprint back to the negotiating table to get our sports center built as soon as possible.

Destination Air is currently beginning services to locations not easily accessible or convenient by road or boat.

The scheduled shuttle service will provide property developers – and tourists and residents too – with the ability to travel to locations previously regarded as inconvenient or possibly too time-consuming to reach.

Between Phuket and Ranong, the options are a four- to five-hour van trip or 30-minute seaplane flight.

Between Phuket and the Koh Lanta-Trang area, a fiveto six-hour van/boat transport or a 20-35-minute Ko Lanta/Ko Mook jump.

Mega-projects, superstores

and MICE

he private sector idea to construct a man-made island to serve as a marina catering to superyachts [Gulu Lalvani's plan to build "Z oran Island" off the coast of Koh Kaew], has drawn a good deal of positive exposure to Phuket's tourism industry.

However, a land reclamation project on this scale is unprecedented for Thailand, even though it has been done in other countries. For this reason, I think it will have to overcome a great deal of bureaucratic and legal hurdles if it is ever to become reality.

There would be numerous issues to consider, including the impact on the environment and on the way of life of the local community. However, as we strive to develop Phuket as an Asian marine tourism hub, this type of project would be a step in the right direction.

It would be great if we could encourage billionaires such as Bill Gates to spend time here – as this would improve our image and attract more investment. Currently, we lack the facilities to cater to the largest superyachts, which can exceed 100 meters in length.

I have seen land reclamation projects that include Meetings, Incentives, Conferences and Exhibition (MICE) facilities, particularly in Dubai. However, the situation is quite different there because they have huge investment budgets, administration systems that allow for rapid decisionmaking, and less restrictive foreign investment and ownership laws.

Anti-marina protests: It worries me that so many different interest groups are getting involved in the debate over whether or not to allow marina development projects, some presenting me with petitions asking me to stop con-

struction. I am not referring solely to the proposed marina at Cape Yamu, but also [Phase 2] of the Chalong Marina project, the final form of which still has yet to be decided upon or approved.

I always try to ensure that a comprehensive series of public hearings are held on such projects, but with so many opposing views it is difficult or impossible to reach a compromise that will keep all sides happy.

I listen to both sides carefully. Investors tell me they strictly follow all Thai law and regulations and that the projects will stimulate the local economy, providing jobs for local residents. Those opposed say the projects will change their way of life and harm

the local environment by destroying mangroves and coastal fishery resources.

We have to consider both sides of the issue and reach a fair conclusion that is in harmony with provincial development plans.

MICE: Similar to the controversy over marina developments is that of building a facility capable of hosting large Meetings, Incentives, Conventions and Exhibitions (MICE) events.

We should have a large MICE facility somewhere in Phuket, because over time we have lost many opportunities to host groups for lack of such a facility.

I have received many calls ernment funding. Having the two

from overseas event organizers wanting to arrange large meetings, road shows or big exhibitions – with the number of attendees ranging from 4,000 to 10,000 people. We have to consider all the benefits being able to host such events could bring, both to the province and its people, and the nation as a whole.

The only place on the island currently capable of hosting large gatherings is Surakul Stadium [which is designed for sporting events and is inappropriate for most MICE activities].

Like the marina developments, however, the issue seems to get bogged down in discussions and disagreements, such as whether or not we really need such a facility and – if we do – where it should be sited.

With the price of land in Phuket, I think it will cost at least three billion baht for such a facility, including land acquisition and construction costs.

We have private sector interest in investing in a large MICE facility [ING Funds (Thailand)], but they need government support with basic infrastructure requirements, especially when it comes to using public-sector land to reduce overall investment

The minimum amount of land needed for such a facility would be about 100 rai. I think the best location would be in Mai Khao, where the Treasury Department controls three plots of land totaling about 2,000 rai.

Work recently began there on a sports complex being built with 70 million baht in initial gov-

projects side-by-side would be beneficial to both; there would still be land available for further development in the future.

However, in response to private sector concerns raised in the meeting chaired by Sports and Tourism Minister Suwit Yodmanee on May 28, it has been decided to allow other private sector groups 60 days to come up with alternative proposals. After that time has elapsed, the provincial committee [chaired by Gov Niran – Ed] will decide which proposal to adopt.

Mega-retailers: We don't know when a new Retail Business Act will be promulgated by the government or what form it will take. In the meantime, we must continue to regulate businesses through existing regulations.

However, we have asked all large retailers to pay taxes to the local administrative bodies in which their branches are located, because it is unfair if they just pay taxes though their headquarters in Bangkok and leave local administrations to deal with the garbage they produce. [As suggested by the Phuket Chamber of Commerce. See 'Tesco rejects tax accusation', page 33, for one retailer's reaction] Some large retailers have already taken action on this matter.

We have also asked the large retailers to voluntarily curb their expansion in the province until the new Retail Business Act goes into effect, especially in regard to the opening of small convenience stores at petrol stations.

Will you please tell me exactly what I need to bring with me to the Phuket Immigration Office on June 29.

Pol Capt Krissarat Nuesen of Phuket Immigration Office, replies:

Retirees who request a one-year permit to stay must satisfy these qualifications:

- 1. Hold a valid non-immigrant O visa.
- 2. Be 50 years of age, or older.
- 3. Have income from one of these sources:
- 3.1 Pension, Social Security, Interest or Dividend of not less than 65,000 baht per month.

One-year permits to stay for retirees

3.2 Have not less than 800,000 baht deposited in any Thai bank account (savings or fixed-term account) for not less than three months before the application date.

The account name must be only in the applicant's name or may be a joint account in the name of the applicant and his/ her registered married spouse

3.3 The applicant's total income derived from 3.1 expected to be received over the 12-month period being applied for PLUS the money deposited in a Thai bank account for at least three months must not be less than 800,000 baht.

Supporting documents required: 1. Application form (TM7),

spouse's name, applicant must provide a copy of the marriage license.

- 4.3 In case of applicant applying for permit to stay on the basis of a combination of income and money deposited in a Thai bank account (see 3.3), applicants must show documents according to requirements listed in 4.2 and 4.3.
- 5. The Immigration Officer reviewing the application reserves the right to ask for additional documents.

Note: Any documents filed in languages other than Thai or English must be translated into Thai or English and the translation and the information the documents contain must be verified as accurate by the embassy or consul of the applicant's home coun-

Also, when applying in person the applicant must bring ALL original documents.

A thing called LOVE

his week, let us ponder a headache-inducing question: What is love? At first blush, it should be an easy question to answer, right? Love, after all, is a universal human condition – the inspiration for literally millions of songs, poems, sonnets, novels, movies and paintings.



Those free-download reg-A istry scanner thingies are designed to do exactly one thing - extract money from your pocket. With few exceptions, they're crap. Pure and simple.

The only ones I would unleash anywhere near a real PC are EasyCleaner (free from personal.inet.fi/business/ toniarts/ecleane.htm) and JV16 Power Tools (about 1,000 baht from www.macecraft.com), but I doubt that either of them will do anything at all to measurably improve your computer. The registry cleaners you see hyped on websites don't even come

I don't know of any major problems with the Vista registry. You might have a few unnecessary entries, but those are nits.

In my opinion, Norton is overkill – and it's expensive, and intrusive. Same with McAfee. Here's what you really need to protect your (Windows XP or Vista) computer:

If you think there's a lot of garbage left on your new computer after you've tried to take it all off, take a look at PC Pitstop at www.pcpitstop.com. The folks there really know what they're doing and the software's both tenacious and inexpensive.

If you commonly go surfing to sites that are a bit on the gray side of the fence – including, most emphatically, sites that advertise those "free" registry cleaners – turn on the advanced Phishing Filter in Firefox (click Tools, Options, Security and check the button that says

Starting on June 8, I experienced some extreme slowdowns on my CAT ADSL line. You know, the line that commonly runs at 1,200 to 1,600Kbps down.

By the afternoon of Friday, June 8, I could barely top 100Kbps. Two days later I recorded 170Kbps. (All of these numbers measure performance to high-speed centers on the US west coast, using the free meter at www.dslreports.com/speed



test?loc= 97) The line went down on Monday afternoon, and bobbed up and down a few times

I wrote to the folks at CAT and they explained that the main fiber-optic line connecting the CAT office in Phuket with Bangkok (and thus on to the outside world) was cut in Surat Thani around noon on Friday, June 8.

I noticed that the speed was back up to snuff on the night of June 13 when I downloaded the Release Candidate of Windows Home Server, a 1.4 GB file. But I've had mixed results since

I submitted a suggestion to CAT that they maintain a simple hot line recorded message about network status, preferably bilin-

Don't know about you, but I would even welcome an SMS message saying something like, "The fiber-optic line was cut and Internet access times will be slow until Thursday." It will be interesting to see if CAT reaches out to its customers with status reports that reflect reality.

BANDWIDTH ENVY

A friend of mine wrote from the States saying that he downloaded that same 1.4 GB Windows Home Server file in less than 10 minutes, using his new Verizon FiOS system, which costs 1,300 baht per month (details at www22.verizon.com/Content/ ConsumerFiOS).

For 1,300 baht per month, he gets 15Mbps down (really), with a free wireless router, free ESPN 360, Disney Connection, and ABC Now news. That's ten times the speed of the CAT ADSL line (when it's running at its fastest) for half the price.

Airport gets top-level backing By Janyaporn Morel MAI KHAO: During a meeting with members of the National Legislative Assembly (NLA) The provincial Police and the Phylate Provincial Police Phylate Phylat

Legislative Assembly (NLA) June 11, Deputy Director Wg Cmdr Wicha Nernlop of the Phuket International Airport (PIA) detailed plans in preparation for

what is expected to be a record-setting season of tourists.

The PIA will expand the curbside area on the upper deck to accommodate a glassed-in X-ray room, parking will be rearranged to allow more cars and the arrival lounge will

grow by a third to meet the increase in tourists, Cmdr Wicha

During the meeting with NLA's Committee on Industry and Tourism, led by Committee Chairman Adm Prasert Boonsong, Cmdr Wicha said that he expects the number of passengers at PIA to increase nearly 20% over 2006.

"We estimate that in 2007 it will rise to 5 million passengers, because we can compare the



first five months of the 2007 fiscal year (Sept 2006 – Jan 2007) when the numbers increased to

2.9 million, from 2.4 million during the same period last year," he said.

There were a total of 29,012 flights in 2006, and during just the first five months of fiscal 2007 the aiport has seen 19,438 flights, an increase of 32.6% over the

same period.

With high season coming, Cmdr Wicha said that the airport is expecting the number of flights to double from 2006, with a significant rise in charter flights.

In order to cope with the large increases, PIA is seeking funding to add eight or nine additional airplane parking places.

The airport will expand the upper deck so the X-ray machines, which all passengers are required to pass their baggage through, can be moved outside the terminal area and into a glassedin enclosure.

'We have spoken about expanding the curb about 2.5 meters, which will make the road


on the top floor more narrow, so we will move the tour group check-in to the new expanded area on the ground floor," he said.

To ease passage through the departure lounge, Cmdr Wicha said that additional check-in counters will be added to increase the total from 33 to 45. PIA will also expand the arrival lounge to increase the capacity from 900 to 1,200.

Cmdr Wicha said that easing passage through Immigration will be a key goal of the improvements as well. "The Immigration counters are very busy in the peak hours during the high season and this is a critical area. By November we will increase the number of counters by six to create 18 check-in points."

Adm Prasert agreed that Immigration needs to be improved and said that the check-in pro-

cess is the area the NLA receives the most complaints about PIA.

Phuket Provincial Police and the

National Intelligence Agency and they usually provide information that we may need. The Royal Thai Police also support us through man power by taking police officers from Tah Chat Chai Police Station and posting them in the airport. There are also about 10 border police officers posted here," he said.

Explaining the challenges PIA faces, Cmdr Wicha said that the rigorous budgetary procedures and red tape are top concerns for the airport.

In response the NLA members said that they would take the airport's concerns back to the Ministry of Finance to try to ease the budget approval process.

They also gave advice for improvements Phuket could make, including starting up direct flights from

Japan to Phuket again after they were halted following the 2004 tsunami.

All a matter of trust

any expatriates living in Phuket have lived in quite a few countries before coming here. Many of these expats have acquired assets in several of these countries and have retained them as investments.

Looking after such a geographically spread-out estate may be manageable during a lifetime, but what happens when the owner of such assets dies?

Without proper planning serious problems can arise for a widow who may not have any understanding of business or for offspring who are still minors. In many cases, expatriates would be better off using an offshore trust to avoid complications.

But what is an offshore trust; indeed, what is a trust?

A trust is a legal entity that can hold and manage assets including companies, property, bank accounts, stocks and shares and anything else an individual may own.

The trust is governed by trustees who may be either individuals, banks, accounting firms, legal firms, insurance companies, trust companies or any of a variety of other entities.

If a trustee is a professional corporate body, it has a legal obligation to manage assets professionally. If it does not, then it is liable for any costs or losses due to its negligence.

The advantage of such a

trust is that it is simple because all the assets of the settlor, the person who sets up the trust, are held in the trust's name and the trust is based in one location.

Nearly all offshore trusts are situated in tax havens such her pleas that she had never been

as the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man. For non-residents, these are true tax havens and no death duties or tax is paid.

Choosing the right trustee, the person who manages the trust, is important. I recently heard a good tale that illustrates this point. A Thai lady By Richard G Watson sibility of fraud. If with two young

children lost her husband. The deceased husband was originally a resident in Hong Kong where he owned property and a business, however he also owned properties in Britain.

The husband left a will that put all his assets into a trust after his death. He had wanted all but one of these properties sold by his trustees and the capital invested in a trust that would provide sufficient income for his widow and children.

Although he was an attorney, he had made a terrible mistake. He gave absolute power over his estate to friends whom he had appointed as trustees.

The deceased had owned a

nice house in Phuket, but with a large mortgage. The trustees decided that his widow must rent out this house in Thailand and move to one in Britain.

The trustees were deaf to

to Britain, couldn't speak English very well and that neither she nor her late husband intended that she should ever stav in the UK.

The lesson here is that appointing individuals as trustees is dangerous. Apart from other problems, there is a good posour attorney had

appointed a corporate body as trustees his wishes would have been carried out faithfully.

Apart from any other consideration where individuals have been appointed trustees, there is always the potential problem of death or severe illness interrupting their ability to serve as trustees. Some security may be found in the use of a "protector".

MONEY

The protector has veto rights over the trustees who must obtain the protector's signed confirmation of their every action.

The drawback is that this can add unnecessary delays. I dealt with one case where the trustees were unable to act for six weeks because the protector was traveling in the US and nobody knew his itinerary.

One of the cheapest ways to form an offshore trust is by using the services of a trust company that is owned by an offshore insurance company. This reduces the cost of establishing and maintaining a trust by a very substantial amount.

It also allows for smaller amounts to be placed into a trust. Most corporate trustees will otherwise refuse to accept assets worth less than about UK£ 250,000 (about 17 million baht). I recently came across a well-known international bank that will not manage a trust unless the assets exceed US\$ 3 million (about 120 million baht).

Apart from the advantages, trusts can be very useful instruments to protect assets in the case of divorce. With an offshore trust, you retain control of the assets, including the right to withdraw all the funds from the trust.

There are many different types of trusts. In most cases, expats will select an offshore discretionary trust as it is the most flexible. But, as with all aspects of personal financial planning, it all depends on the individual situation. One of the advantages of an offshore discretionary trust is that the trustees are guided by a letter of wishes.

During the lifetime of the settlor, this document can be changed at anytime to include or exclude beneficiaries or the terms in which they can benefit. It is not necessary to have this document drafted in legal terminology. Trustees simply want clear instructions that are not ambiguous.





Nicola Green from the UK was the first woman to complete the marathon, completing the circuit in 3:16:46, followed by Lai Chee Yong from Singapore (3:50:46) and Diana Finkel from the US (3:51:03).

Thai Niwat Oytip won the 21km half marathon with a time of 1:21:14. Anthony Seakins from the UK finished second (1:22:25), followed by Dominic Yu Ho Chung from China (1:22:36).

The top three female finishers in the half marathon were Vivian Tang from Singapore (1:29:05), Gillian Caskka from the UK (1:33:29) and Pauline Mulroy (1:36:51).

More than 3,000 athletes from 40 countries took part in the events, which also included a 10km fun run, a 5km walk and a 1km kids' run.

The races started early

morning with the marathon runners leaving the start line at Laguna Phuket at 5 am. The half marathon started at 6 am, followed by the 10-km fun run at 6:30 am and the walk at 6:55 am. The kids' run started at 9 am.

The walk, introduced to the event this year, saw a large turnout of teams from local businesses and organizations, many of which wore team colors and had pledged to raise money for charity. There were also many individual entries, bringing the total number of participants in the walk to 500.



A Brief History of Gardening 2: THE BEER STRIKES BACK

'm not a fan of sequels. They're always a disappointment. You'll remember Jaws – that mid-1970s blockbuster that scared us all half to death. Especially when that head dropped into view behind the porthole in that sunken boat... Anyway, the film was superb, and went on to make millions.

Then somebody thought that *Jaws 2* would be a good idea. In the rush to try to cash in on an already successful idea, however, the filmmakers failed to remember that the film still had to be good. Unfortunately, it was terrible.

The big rubber shark they made for the second film by now looked a bit silly, and we'd probably become bored with that plastic fin approaching unsuspecting beach goers. We probably only looked forward to them being eaten to liven things up a bit.

Hardly the response the producers had in mind.

Generally, all "part twos" fall into the same category – and parts three, four and five, come to that. How many times was Rocky going to have to crawl out of the gutter and train himself up to become world champion? He did it once, fine, but once we knew the underdog was going to win at the end, it all got a bit boring.

Sensing that the world cinema-going population is becoming swamped with way too many over-hyped and under-achieving movie sequels, over the past few years Hollywood studios have been trying to distinguish their numerous part twos, threes and fours by giving them catchy subtitles.

It seems that the days of obligatory add-on digits such as Rambo 1-15 are long gone. In

recent years we've seen Charlie's Angels: Full Throttle, American Pie 3: The Wedding and Legally Blonde 2: Red, White and Blonde. My personal favorite (movie title that is – the film was awful) is Scary Movie 3: Episode I – Lord of the Brooms.

I will admit that the title Austin Powers: The Spy Who Shagged Me is a lot more interesting than Austin Powers 2, but what's even more fascinating is how the title got past the censors in the first place, given its somewhat lascivious origins. In fact, I wonder if this paragraph will even make it into the pages of the Gazette. We shall see.

Book sequels somehow get away with it, and I really don't know why. There have been numerous lawyer/detective/crime/thriller-type books recently that almost defy logic with regard to how many times the same characters appear in one book after the next – they're all very readable, somehow. Or maybe I'm just easily entertained.

Those who got as far as this page in the *Gazette* last week, nestled in just before the classifieds, may have caught a glimpse of *A Brief History of Gardening*. If Tom Clancy can get away with it, then I see no reason why I shouldn't continue where I left off last week.

It's now a week of beer later, but I vaguely remember chuntering on about explorers in centuries gone by moving plants from one part of the world to another. Some of them even had plants named in their honor; the vainer types probably named these plants after themselves.

It doesn't take a genius to figure out that the French explorer, Louis Antoine de Bougainville was one of the first to come across the incredibly widespread creeper that we now see all over the island and most, if not all tropical regions of the world, the bougainvillea.

Then there's Joel Roberts Poinsett, the 19th-century physician, botanist and American statesman. He was responsible for introducing the Christmas plant from its native home of the Pacific coast of Mexico to the rest of the world. Predictably, the official name for this bright red and green plant is the poinsettia.

The 19th century was a busy time for gardener-explorers. A nursery called Veitch, in the UK, sent its chaps out all over the place. Most famously, they were responsible for the unimaginatively-named Victoria Amazonica, a giant South American plant named after the British queen at that time. It's a decidedly weird pitcher plant that traps its insect prey in a giant cup before slowly dissolving and ingesting them.

This was when orchids appeared in the Western world. They were expensive then, and haven't reduced in price much since. A single orchid bloom in the UK is still well over a pound (nearly 70 baht); funny how you'd be disappointed if there weren't one or two stuck in the top of your cocktail in Phuket.

Our forefathers didn't seem content just to borrow their tropical discoveries from their native homes – they felt the urge to modify them too. The cordyline, plumeria, and hibiscus they brought back were soon hybridized into countless varieties that were sometimes unrecognizable as being related to the original.

This hybridization continues today. As an example, it's likely that as little as 20 years ago, Thai gardeners had no more than about 10 varieties of heliconia to choose from. Today there are hundreds; the colorful bracts are nowhere near as predictable as they once

Tropical plants are no longer reserved for the tropics – they're everywhere now. While gardeners in the Western world do their best to keep them alive, our problem here is more likely to be keeping them in check. Gardening doesn't get much easier than this.

As sequels go, A Brief History of Gardening 2 doesn't have quite the same dramatic impact as *Rambo: First Blood Part II*, but at least I've done my bit to cash in. The fortunate part is that after last week's initial installment, it could hardly go much further downhill. I wonder if I can get away with saying shag again...?

Sunbursts and sunsets

he Tex-Mex cuisine and margaritas at Coyote in Patong are every bit as good as those in the other Coyote restaurants in Hong Kong and Bangkok.

Just as impressive as the food, however, is the unique dé cor, which adds much-needed chic to Patong's beach road.

Coyote General Manager Tim Rawlinson told the Gazette that the restaurant, which opened January 1, is the largest Coyote yet. The main floor is 900 square meters with a small VIP lounge. Upstairs is an even larger room, with 25 tables, suitable for functions of over 100 guests.

The most popular seating by far is the second-floor terrace, accessed by an escalator beside Watson's Pharmacy.

The perfect place to sip two-for-one margaritas alfresco and watch the sunset, the terrace is a sturdy wooden deck with attractive canvas parasols covering each of the 14 tables.

Equally attractive are the waitresses, shapely and all decked out in tight jeans and jean jackets, midriffs ever-so-slightly exposed and heads covered with wide-brimmed cowboy hats curvaceous and cute, but not over-the-top.

The terrace is high enough to completely overlook the beach road, with its tangles of electric wires and traffic chaos. A few minutes taking in the view and enjoying the sea breeze and the question automatically raises itself: why aren't there more places like this in Patong?

Words to describe the overall ambiance and dé cor inside Coyote might include cute and colorful, yet distinctive and rustic. Dominant colors inside are pale shades of orange and blue - very easy on the eye. Coupled with the cheerful service staff, the overall effect is informal but classy.

"Every time we open a Coyote restaurant, we want to stick

with our dé cor and color scheme. We want the same menu and drinks, but without having the look of being just another franchise. Our motto is 'Mexican With Attitude', so we work each locally, individually," Tim said.

The man responsible for the interior design is Irishman Micky Doherty, also a shareholder and managing director of Eclipse Managements, which operates all three Covote branches.

A long-time resident of Southeast Asia, Micky has also traveled extensively through Mexico and the US southwestern states, sourcing distinctively Mexican and Tex-Mex dé cor: lighting fixtures, prints and bric-a-brac that lend an authentic touch and conjure up images of a Mexican hacienda – albeit a high-tech one.

In daytime, the sea and sky panorama of Patong Bay illuminate both the upstairs and downstairs in natural light though enormous glass walls.

At night, the lighting is impressive throughout. Along the lights, one for each seat, gently

Ceiling beams, though made of concrete, are painted black, giving the look of strong timber beams. Below, the bottom of the bar is bathed across its length in gentle green, the source of which is hidden away.

Terracotta and ceramic are well featured along walls, while glazed images of sunbursts adorn glass surfaces. Solar and lunar images are a recurring theme throughout, from the company's logo to the lighting fixtures, also Mexican, which radiate individual shafts of light along the soft sandstone walls. Currently, only the first floor and terrace are open, although the enormous upper floor is virtually complete and ready to open





New Chalong center gets to the Point

onstruction work on the commercial buildings in the first phase of Chalong Center Point, opposite the Chalong Police Station on Chao Fa East Rd, has begun and is expected to be completed by the end of the year.

Chalong Center Point will be a development of two commercial buildings, a serviced apartment building and a food center on about two rai of land. The site can be accessed from the Chalong Pier area at the rear as well as from Chao Fa East Rd.

"I would like to make Chalong Center Point a new meeting point in the area," developer Samran Jindapon told the *Gazette*.

The development is divided into two phases. The first comprises two buildings each of two stories. The buildings will have a total of 15 units of 120 square meters each. Phase one also includes a serviced apartment building with 40 units.

A food court will be built in the second phase.

"I have seen the change and development in the Chalong area, and see that the area can still grow as there are now many

developers, both Thai and foreigners, coming to invest here.

"I'd like to make it a new venue for shopping. I want it to be a tourist center for people who come to Chalong and Rawai, and for people who pass through to Kata and Karon, too," K. Samran said.

He added that he expects Chalong Center Point to host businesses such as banks, gold and jewelry shops and restaurants.

"We designed the buildings to completely support the businesses, unlike other projects that design the second floor as a living area. I want the entire area of the units to be used for commercial purposes," he said.

K. Samran said he expects to hand over the phase-one commercial buildings to tenants by the end of January. The 40-unit, serviced-apartment building is expected to be completed by the end of 2008.

"About 80% of the commercial units have been reserved. Rentals will be 10,000 baht a month plus key money of 150,000 baht per year for a minimum contract of 10 years. We also require a security deposit of 100,000 baht which we will return at the end of

the contract if there is no damage to the building," he said.

Chalong Center Point is designed in a modern style by local architect Urupong Prateep Na Thalang from Home One Design Co Ltd.

The buildings will be constructed of concrete with high,

wide windows on the front of the buildings.

All of the space in phase one is intended for commercial use and bathrooms will be provided on each floor.

Parking spaces and an access road from the project to Chalong Pier will also provided.

"The emphasis of the design is to support commercial activity on both floors. This is a good location for businesses as the population in the Chalong area has increased and many new property estates are coming into the area," he said.

The serviced apartments are expected to support the marina project as there will be more tourists coming to the area and the food center in the second phase will help support the total development.

"I think that our project is in an prime location and business operators should get a quick return on their investment," he added.
