Toddler killed in botched robbery

RASSADA: A two-year-old girl and her nanny have died after they had their throats slit in a botched burglary by two local youths on the evening of June 22.

Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Col Chalit Tinthanee last night announced that the attackers, a 15-year-old student at Phuket Technical College (PTC) and his 17-year-old friend, entered the house of PTC teacher Narisorn Phueng-rang in Baan Kabout about 5 pm.

Once inside they were confronted by the nanny, Dang Panthip, 40. She said she did not have anything of value for them to take and began to shout for help, and K. Narisorn's two-year-old daughter, Nitchanart, began to cry.

The robbers, afraid someone would hear the commotion, hit Nitchanart on the head with a knife holder, which only made her scream louder.

To quiet the child and the nanny, the youths then slit both their throats, Col Chalit said.

K. Dang's daughter then walked in on the robbers, but managed to escape the burglars and remember their license plate

to vacate SorPorKor land plots BANGKOK (The Nation): To Supreme Court on June 21 to 10.

Charearn told

BANGKOK (*The Nation*): The Supreme Court on June 21 upheld an Appeals Court verdict and ordered Phuket businessman Charearn Thavornwongwongse to vacate four plots of *SorPorKor* land for landless farmers covering roughly 16 rai in Kamala and Kathu Districts.

According to the court, K. Charearn could no longer be considered a farmer because he owned various businesses.

He is the managing director of Tilok Company, which operates three hotels in Phuket under the Thavorn Group name, including the flagship 150-room Thavorn Grand Plaza Hotel in the heart of Phuket City.

Tilok's other assets in Phuket City include a crocodile farm on Chana Jaroen Rd, originally set up as a tourist attraction but now only raises crocodiles commercially.

K. Charearn, who was not present at the court ruling, has 36 other plots of land covering more than 60 rai, the court noted.

K. Charearn's lawyer, Benjama Abhaiwongse, said his client would respect the court's decision, but would ask the Agricultural Land Reform Office (ALRO), the plaintiff in the case, to let him lease the four plots.

K. Benjama said K. Charearn had acquired and used these plots since 1957.

They remained rubber plantations and fruit orchards, he said.

The ALRO has filed several lawsuits to evict wealthy people from *SorPorKor* land that had been earmarked for agricultural use by landless farmers.

There are five cases before the Supreme Court and three others pending at the Court of Appeals.

Beachcomber's nightmare found in Nai Thon

NAI THON: Police are hoping to establish the identity of a headless and badly decomposed human corpse discovered washed up on Nai Thon Beach June 19.

Sub Lt Thianchai Duangsuwan of the Tah Chat Chai Police Station told the *Gazette* the gruesome discovery was made at about 10:30 am on the stretch of beach in front of the Naithonburi Beach Resort.

"Although the head and

legs were missing, we can identify it as that of a man. It was badly decayed and appears to have been partially eaten by marine animals," Lt Thianchai said.

Photos of the corpse, prominently displayed on the front page of a daily Thai language newspaper, showed that the corpse was clad only in a pair of light blue underpants.

The only flesh remaining was from the lower abdomen

down to the knees.

"There were no cut marks or other signs that would indicate foul play," Lt Thianchai said.

From the man's size it is more likely he is Asian and not Caucasian, police said. Lt Thianchai estimated the man died about two weeks ago.

"We suspect he may have been a crew member on a fishing boat," Lt Thianchai said.

Hotel worker killed in crash

KARON: Nakamura Masakazu, 41, a circus entertainer at Club Med, died after he was run over by a tuk-tuk on a hill near Le Meridien Phuket Beach Resort early on June 19.

Mr Masakazu was riding a rented Honda Dream motorbike in heavy rain around 6 am when he lost control on a downhill section of the road from Patong to Karon, Lt Col Sanguan Muangtham, duty inspector of Chalong Police Station, said.

"His helmet came off when he hit the pavement and his body slid across the center line, into the path of an oncoming tuk-tuk driven by Suree Phankhor. He died at the scene," Col Sanguan said.

Suree, charged with careless driving causing death, was released on 50,000-baht bail, he added.

A statement released by Club Med said that Mr Masakazu joined Club Med six years ago and was organizing the resort's circus entertainment at the time of his death.

"It is very hard to find words to express such a big feeling – the loss of a great organizer, good

friend and a real gentleman. The entire management team will always keep the memory of his smile and humor, his energy and commitment," said Club Med Phuket General Manager Alessandro Cordogli

Further south in Kata, Lamphun Kotpanna, 27, from Sakhon Nakhon, died after her motorbike was hit by a pickup truck on the steep hill near the Marina Phuket Resort on June 25.

Sayan Thammapan, of the Phuket Ruamjai Rescue Foundation, told the *Gazette*, "She was riding her blue Honda Sonic motorbike on the hill, which has a very steep slope, about 9:30 pm."

He added that witnesses said that a pickup truck being driven at high speed hit the motorbike from behind then sped off.

"She suffered head injuries and her neck was broken. She died at the scene," K. Sayan said.

"No witnesses can remember the license plate number, color or make of the pickup that hit her," he added.



2 tonnes of kratom seized in raid

THALANG: Police seized about 2,000 kilograms of kratom leaves at a house in Thalang June 21.

Lt Col Kritthana Poothiluecha of Thalang Police Station told the *Gazette* that police acted on a tip-off to raid the home of motorcycle taxi driver Jin Meechai in Sri Soonthorn.

In the back yard of the home, located behind Wat Tha Rua, police found 12 kratom trees ranging in height from 10 to 15 meters.

"Jin confessed to selling kratom to construction workers so they could work harder. He planted the trees and started selling it years ago. Police found them and cut them down,"Col Kritthana said,

"I think this is the biggest kratom bust we've ever had. However, we are following his connections to investigate whether we can make more arrests," Col Kritthana said.

Jin, 53, was charged with possession and sale of kratom.

Native to Thailand, kratom leaves act as a stimulant when ingested.

Office thief caught on CCTV

PHUKET CITY: Provincial bureaucrats will sleep better at night, following the June 21 arrest by Phuket City Police of a man wanted for stealing valuables from government offices on the island.

At a press conference yesterday, Phuket City Police Station Superintendent Col Nos Sawetalek presented 30-year-old Prayuth Kruakaew as the thief, along with four laptop computers, three mobile phones and cash in baht, US dollars and Chinese yuan as evidence.

Three men – Nopparat Phakdee, 23; Phurin Eiamtrakul, 20; and Peerapat Kongchuay, 23 – along with one woman – Thanasak Chaisaengsri, 22 – were charged with receiving the stolen property.

Prayuth's arrest followed a report to police by officials at the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) offices, where images of Prayuth with office property in hand were captured on closed-circuit television cameras (CCTV) on June 2.

Col Nos said Prayuth had confessed to stealing laptop computers, mobile phones and cash

left unattended at government

Police said that Prayuth had also admitted to roaming the corridors of schools, municipality offices, student dormitories, and patient wards at Mission Hospital and Vachira Phuket Hospital in his quest for valuables to pilfer.

Prayuth's modus operandi was to arrive in a rented Jeep at

his chosen location around noon under the pretext of conducting official business, but knowing that government offices on the island are often unattended from noon until 1 pm, when civil servants break for lunch, Col Nos said.

"He was released from prison last month on similar charges. He did the same type of thing in Surat Thani," Col Nos told reporters.

However, two nights earlier, thieves made the most of the dark and stormy night and made off with about 90,000 baht in cash after breaking into a Christian

foundation at Phun Pol Night Plaza, in Phuket City.

"Burglars broke into the New Life Foundation at 74/123 Phun Pol Night Plaza. They scaled a wall at the rear of the building, then removed louvers to enter a work room on the second floor.

"The burglars pried open work desks, making off with about 90,000 baht in cash they found there," Lt Col Ampolwat Saengrueng told the *Gazette*.

"Although we have fingerprints and footprints of the burglars at the scene, and I have interviewed all the people who work at the foundation, we have yet to determine a prime suspect," said Col Ampolwat.

Police couldn't find any witnesses to the break-in, he said.

In another break-in at building with a religious affiliation on the same night, persons unknown made off with Jatukham Ramathep amulets worth a total of about 10,000 baht from Wat Sapam on Thepkrasattri Rd.

Yuwadee Yuthitham, a volunteer worker at the temple, told the *Gazette*, "Burglars pried open a glass cabinet that contained Jatukham amulets. We have already reported this to Phuket Police Station," she said.

Police officials in Ranong report that they have arrested a suspect in the theft of the amulets, but are awaiting further evidence and reports from Phuket.

Police smash ya bah ring Dutchman arrested after car chase, shootout

KATHU: On a night of rain, gunfights and car chases, police smashed a major ya bah (methamphetamine) ring on June 19, arresting five people and seizing 1,384 ya bah pills and 115,000 baht in cash as evidence.

The operation started with a routine drug bust on June 18 in front of Rungtawee Mansion in Kathu, where Maj Chalermchai Hernsawat of the Phuket City Police and his team arrested Rungsan Pongtrakul for possession of two ya bah pills.

Upon questioning, Rungsan named his supplier as Sayam Jamjantra. Undercover police arranged to buy 20 ya bah pills the following day from Sayam on Soi Irawadee Ketho, in Kathu.

As Sayam was being placed under arrest, police noticed a red tuk-tuk nearby making a hasty retreat from the scene. In heavy rain, a patrol car gave chase. The driver of the tuk-tuk fired two shots at the patrol car, the occupants of which returned fire.

The tuk-tuk driver managed to get away, but his vehicle was seen parked in front of Sritrang Romyen dormitory. Once spotted by police, the man tried to flee on foot by scaling a wall and running across a rooftop.

The rooftop gave way, sending the man crashing to the floor of the house, much to the surprise of its occupants. Saying he was in a hurry, the man gave them his Thai ID card as collateral and promised to return the next day to repair the damage.

The man escaped, but the family turned over the ID card to

police, who identified him as Pornchai Limpanich, who was still at-large as this edition went to

Already in custody, Sayam named his supplier as Ketchakart "Kim" Kitpunwong, a resident of SB Park Mansion on Soi Thida. Police found the man in the parking lot of the apartment complex, where they searched his body and uncovered a fully-loaded Glock 17 semi-automatic pistol and 100,000 baht in cash. A search of his room uncovered five bags of ya bah, each containing 200

The alleged leader of the drug ring, also a resident of SB Mansion, then happened to pull his car into the parking lot while police were still there.

The man, Suwit Kaewnit, rammed the patrol truck police used to block the exit. Officers then shot out one of his tires and took him into custody. A body search uncovered 200 ya bah pills, 15,000 baht cash and a book containing a list of customers.

A search of Suwit's room uncovered a .32 automatic pistol with seven bullets, aluminum foil, packs of drinking straws and other equipment commonly used to package ya bah.

Police also arrested Suwit's roommate Noppateep Petrak, whom they suspected of being a

A more thorough search a few days later uncovered 164 more ya bah pills in a bag taped underneath the television set.

Maj Chalermchai said the gang members used rented cars to drive to Bangkok, where they bought up to 10,000 pills per trip. Once in Phuket, they could sell the drugs at 500 baht each, he added.

All the suspects were then remanded in custody at Phuket City Police Station except from Sayam, who is being held at Tung Tong Police Station.

for office hold-up

PHUKET CITY: A down-on-hisluck Dutchman was arrested June 22 for the June 15 robbery of the management office of Phuket Villa California.

The man, Jeroen De Valk, 35, allegedly made away with 74,000 baht – but not before CCTV cameras recorded his motorcycle license plate number.

On June 15, a man dressed in black walked into the offices of Phuket Villa California on Chao Fa East Rd with a replica gun and demanded money. Rungruedee Engchuan, the lone office worker at the time, ran for cover while the man searched through the office, eventually making off with the money.

Col Chalit Thintanee, Deputy Commander of Phuket Provincial Police, said that although the man's face was not visible in the CCTV recording, the license plate was clear and led to the arrest of De Valk.

At a press conference after the arrest, police said De Valk

has lived in Thailand for six months, bought a house on credit and set up a clothing store with a Thai woman – but the store was not making money.

The gun used in the hold-up turned out to be of the variety used for lighting cigarettes, not shooting bullets.

Motorbike thieves nabbed

PHUKET CITY: Police have busted a gang of motorbike thieves, including their leader, who have allegedly stolen about 50 motorbikes over the past four months.

Pol Col Nos Svettalekha, superintendent of Phuket City Police Station, told the Gazette, "The leader of the gang is Krittanai 'Max' Buapeng, 36, from Krabi. We followed him for about four months" before his arrest June 20.

"He had about 10 henchmen who stole motorbikes for him. They stole only Honda bikes, and even stole bikes to order. The motorbikes were sent to Burma through Ranong," he added.

"We arrested his gang in two raids, arresting about five people each time: one raid was at Kapoe in Ranong and the other was while gang members were passing through the Tah Chat Chai checkpoint.

"Over the past four months they stole about 50 motorbikes," Col Nos said, adding that only seven had been recovered.

Col Nos said that all gang members had confessed to the thefts. A court date had yet to be set, he added.

Chinese tourist drowns in strong Patong surf

PATONG: Strong waves claimed the life of Chinese tourist Wing Wong, 40, who drowned at Patong Beach about 1:30 pm June 25.

Sub Lt Naruwat Puthawiro, duty investigator of Kathu Police Station, today told the Gazette, "He and his friends were swimming at Patong Beach. Although I have yet to question his friends, at that time there were strong waves. I suspect that Wing Wong was probably tired and drowned.

"His body is at Patong Hospital, waiting for relatives to collect for his funeral," Sub Lt Naruwat added.

About 1:30 pm June 24, a female Korean teen-

ager swam into difficulties and had to be rescued from the strong surf at Kata.

An official at the Phuket Tourist Rescue Center told the Gazette that the young woman was swimming with about four male friends. "While they were swimming, the girl was caught in a dangerous rip tide and she started struggling and disappearing below the surface, and she took in some sea water."

"We rescued her and took her up to the beach. She was in shock but still conscious. Although she seemed not to be in a serious condition we took her to Phuket International Hospital," the official said.

Body found in Klong Bang Yai

RASSADA: The body of a man aged 20 to 30 was found floating in Klong Bang Yai near the Chokthawee fish raft in the port area around noon on June 24.

Capt Krurg-rit Ritnuang of Phuket Police Station told the Gazette, "When we lifted the body out of the water we saw that his trousers were lowered as if he had fallen from a boat while he was going to the toilet.

"We found two wounds, on

his shoulder and his neck, but they do not look like they caused his death, so we have to wait for the result of an autopsy," Capt Krurg-rit said.

"No person has been reported missing in the area and we have already questioned local fishermen.

"The man was about 165 centimeters tall and he looks more Burmese than Thai," he added.

nlike the breakneck pace of development that has seen areas of Phuket's west coast turn from backwaters to boom towns, much of Phuket's east coast has only begun to surge in recent years as new projects and developments discover its untapped resources.

One of the areas that has seen the biggest growth is Pa Khlok, where tax revenue jumped from about 4 million baht per year from 2001 to 2004 to a whopping 30 million baht in 2006 alone. Growth isn't slowing in 2007, as developers push to move forward with the area's next major development: the planned Yamu Marina.

The marina project by The Yamu company – a subsidiary of Campbell Kane – will have berths for 39 boats and will be a part of a hotel and villa development covering 100 rai in Ban Yamu.

Not all residents of Pa Khlok and Ban Yamu see the development of the marina as a boon to the area, however, and the village has become largely divided into two factions on the issue. Following a meeting with the governor and environmental surveyors, the marina project has been put on hold.

At a meeting with representatives of the two factions of villagers, the company, environmental groups and government officials on June 12, Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit said, "This case will take a long time and it requires a permit first. The best way to go about that is to have The Yamu company, OrBorTor (Tambon Administration Organization) Pa Khlock and the involved officers go down to the village and come to an understanding with the leaders of both groups of villagers. It is also important that the company reconsider the environmental effects again closely."

Panya Sampaorat, President of *OrBorTor* Pa Khlok, explained that development trends

Yamu marina on hold

Controversial plans to build a marina at Yamu Bay have been put on hold until further notice as Governor Niran Kalayanamit calls for all sides in the dispute to reach a consensus agreement over the project.

in Pa Khlok have a surprisingly short history.

"Within the last three to four years, Pa Khlok has seen about five residential projects, a golf club, a hotel and a factory spring up in the area," he said. "The villagers around here did not have a very good source of income before that. Their quality of life was poor, but now their lives are improving thanks to these businesses."

But whether the villagers really want to risk their heritage and coastal-resources for a more tourism-dependent lifestyle seems to be a matter of disagreement. One small group of residents remains highly vocal in their opposition.

On April 20, a group of these disgruntled villagers met with Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima, representatives of The Yamu and other local officials to state their objections to the project. They primarily opposed the potential impact on local fisheries and the re-routing of a road that forces them to drive around the project site rather than directly to their houses.

V/Gov Worapoj responded by commanding the Phuket Provincial Land Transportation Office (PPLTO), Phuket Provincial Fisheries Office, *OrBorTor* Pa


Khlok and villagers come to an understanding within 15 days.


The demand did not succeed, however. The May 3 meeting between Vikanda Tongnuekang, a representative from Andaman Environmental Consultants, Yamu company representatives and the group of villagers ended in a stalemate, with no consensus or common ground found.

The very next day, Anusorn Somboon, village chief of Ban Yamu, held a meeting in Ban Pa Khlok with 66 villagers, K. Vikanda and Yamu company representatives. At that gathering, villagers demanded that the pier project be stopped and the original road to Ban Yamu restored. K. Vikanda released results from an April survey of 200 villagers, showing that 75% of the villagers responded in favor of the project while just 17% were against it.

The 66 residents at the meeting expressed disbelief. They said they had not heard of the survey and were skeptical that so many of their fellow villagers could possibly be in favor of the project.

"Almost all of the villagers oppose the project," said K. Anusorn. "After we met with Gov Niran and he informed us

about the project, he said he wanted to hear results in seven days. V/Gov Worapoj was put in charge of all public hearing issues related to the project," he said.

Unlike village chief Anusorn, *OrBorTor* President Panya said that the villagers had good reason to support the plan, which he says will contribute further to the *OrBorTor*'s bountiful coffers and create even more jobs.

"Last year the government received 30 million baht in taxes and we used 10 million baht of that to help improve the quality of the villagers' lives. This year we expect to receive 29 million baht and we will continue to promote job growth, support education for the children and support the religious and cultural growth of the village.


"In the future we hope to also develop the Pa Khlok road, the view at Yamu Bay and put in more electric cables for the villagers.

"We still don't have enough electricity and water, but we have supplied electricity to 98% or 99% of the villagers. We will continue to cooperate with Phuket Provincial Irrigation Office to install pipes to bring water to villagers who lack it."

Last March, Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation chief Aroon Kerdsom told the *Gazette* that Pa Khlok was the part of the island which faced the greatest water supply problems during the dry season.

On May 29, some 200 villagers in favor of the Yamu marina plan showed their support by staging a banner-waving rally outside Phuket Provincial Hall. With representatives of The Yamu company conspicuously present, but claiming to have no influence over events, they pre-

sented to Gov Niran a document stating their support. Provincial Chief Administrative Officer (Palad) Piya Bharatasilpin accepted the document on the governor's behalf and urged the crowd to leave the area.

Group leader Bangsod Densiri, 56, said, "We came here to show our support for the Yamu marina project. Nobody put us up to this. We came by ourselves because we want Yamu to enjoy the benefits of development, just as parts of the island have," he said.

"Phuket is a tourist destination...but the development is happening very slowly at Baan Yamu. We want the project to give villagers more jobs, more money and a better life," he said.

In yet another tit-for-tat, on June 13 another contingent of villagers, this time only 20-strong, arrived at Phuket Provincial Hall to show their opposition and await the outcome of a hearing about the marina. They held up a banner reading, "Please oppose the disgraceful Yamu marina project, which will destroy lives and resources."

Instead of opposing the project, the officials at the meeting accepted the complaints and said that a decision would have to wait.

Part of the stated reason for the delay is an environmental impact study of the ecological diversity of the area.

According to a survey, Pa Khlok has a total of 1,800 rai of seagrass, including 10 rai in Yamu Bay, near where The Yamu wants to build their pier. The single largest expanse of seagrass in Phuket waters, it has four species of seagrass that support a wide variety of animals, including the dugong, which is highly endangered in Thai waters.

Yamu Bay also has 75 rai of coral, according to a government survey. The survey estimates that while only 25% of that

coral is still alive, the rest provides a habitat for other marine life.

While the pier will not be built directly upon either the coral or the seagrass, its construction will require the dredging of about 30,000 cubic meters of marine clay from the sea floor. Such dredging could cause suspended sediment to settle atop coral and other marine species, potentially damaging or destroying it, the survey group stated.

At a mangrove planting ceremony held June 21, Managing Director of The Yamu Ian Henry said that the damage to the area has already been done. If anything, the project stands to improve environmental conditions in the bay, he maintains.

"I don't think that people realize that marinas create sea life, and the barnacles come in," he said. "Both this and the marina helps to bring sea life back in and increase the fishing as well, so they can come down and fish."

"To be honest I think if you ask people in the village they are happy, they are the ones who come to us with ideas."

"We coexist now, so it's important that they let us know what they want to do."

Despite his enthusiasm, the plan has stalled for now – though it seems likely to proceed after still more negotiations are held. V/Gov Worapoj said the provincial officials are waiting for those negotiations to take place before the permits are issued.

"Both the for and against groups live together here, so we must reach a consensus," he said. "I cannot predict the course of events, but in time the entire community must reach a single conclusion. When it does, the provincial officers will proceed following their advice."

It's no yolk! Egg theft ring cracked

NAKHON RATCHASIMA: Accounts of police breaking up rings of drug dealers, armed robbers and teenage motorcycle thieves are a fairly common occurrence in Thailand

Officers from Chalermprakiat District Police had a more unusual task at hand on June 20, however, when they managed to crack a ring of egg thieves who had been terrorizing chicken coops across Khorat.

The gang came unstuck when a security guard at Jakkarach Chicken Farm reported that there were six suspicious characters spotted carrying trays of eggs near the farm

When police arrived, they found the six loading eggs from a hiding place in the woods onto waiting motorbikes. When they saw police, the thieves fled in all directions. Two managed to make a clean escape, but Thanuphon Chotithonglang, 22, Wiwat Riamphit, 22, Aekachai Phengphin, 22, and Arayathai Taophali, 23, were all arrested. Police also seized 1,739 chicken eggs and three motorcycles as evidence.

Thanuphon confessed to police that there were six members of the gang, who divided up duties among themselves. Two would sneak into the farm and move trays of eggs to the fence. Two others would move the eggs to a hiding place in the woods, where the remaining two members would guard them. After they had collected enough eggs, they loaded them onto their motorbikes and made their escape, Thanuphon explained.

Col Phinij Phongphamon, Superintendent of Chalermprakiat District Police Station, said theft cases were increasing due to the poor state of the economy. The suspects in this case worked selling SIM cards for a telecoms company. Some were already married with children, he said.

As some of the gang had previously been egg farm employees, they knew how the operations worked - and how best to exploit them.

After the thefts, the gang would divide up the eggs. Some were eaten, the rest sold at discount rates in nearby villages, Col Phinij said.

They had targeted a number of farms in Chalermprakiat and Jakkarach districts, he added.

The four were charged with trespass and theft. Police are still hunting for their two accomplices.

Police said that they would return the eggs to the farm rather than keep them as evidence – as they were worried about them going rotten while the legal system processed Source: Kom Chad Luek

'Voluntourism' days are over

hao Lak is having a very different rainy season this year, since most volunteers and tsunami-help organizations have packed their bags for good. Several shophouses that had been rented out to such organizations are now vacant.

While volunteers had filled restaurants and local pubs during past low season evenings, there is now a vacuum that might financially hurt several Khao Lak-based businesses. While there are more low season tourists around this year, the "voluntourism" days are definitely over for Khao Lak.

Not everyone is sad about this fact. Too many times I have overheard local expats complaining about the (in their eyes) "useless" volunteers who, "instead of inspiring locals to take matters in their own hands, went ahead sweating it out building houses for tsunami victims, while the 'poor victims' sat next to the construction site playing cards and having a good time over a bottle of *lao kao*."


A never-ending story is the one about too many longtail boats being built by volunteers to help tsunami-affected fishermen. Many of these boats were sold by locals shortly after receiving them to make a quick buck. Even today donated longtail boats that have never been in the water can be found rotting away alongside Khao Lak's roads.

It is obvious that very few help organizations were able to provide useful long-term support to proverbially "teach the man to fish" and equip locals with the skills and knowledge to land longterm, well-paid jobs to support their families.

One of these very rare useful organizations is the Eco Tourism Training Center (ECT), located on Bang Niang Beach, which is managed by Reid Ridgway. Here, locals are trained in diving skills up to the level of dive master, while enhancing their gener-

al understanding of nature protection and awareness. All former ETC students have found well-paid jobs in Thailand's dive industry and four of them have become certified scuba diving instructors

The best thing is that ETC's worldwide media coverage has brought hundreds of tourists interested in the project to Khao Lak, making the center a win-win project for everyone in Khao Lak. Since the ETC depends on student sponsorships, the center constantly needs new donors, I encourage you to find more information about the project at www.etcth.org

Build me up. While the resurrection of Khao Lak has been hailed a successful recovery story, the region is busy following up on that promise. The reconstruction of the Khao Lak Laguna resort, which will open for business this year, is an important step forward as it is the first big upmarket resort visitors will see on their left-hand side when entering central Khao Lak as they arrive from Phuket International Airport.

Before the reconstruction started, the area where the Khao Lak Laguna resort once stood was an open expanse of plain red dirt – not an inviting sight for firsttime travelers to Khao Lak. Now

this gash has been restored and will provide 150 rooms towards Khao Lak's goal of 5,000 rooms open for the coming high season.

Yet another gap on Nang Thong Beach has been filled by the reconstruction of the Nang Thong Bay Resort II, which will also open its doors this coming November.


The construction of a new shopping complex has started opposite the Nang Thong supermarket. The bill-



Bombing kills district chief

powerful roadside bomb in Pattani killed three officials, including a district chief and a high-ranking security officer on June 19.

Mai Kaen District Chief Chayaphat Raksoyos, Col Surasak Phosutha from the Internal Security Operations Command (Isoc) and Ahama Laharn, a Mai Kaen defense volunteer, were traveling in the same pickup truck when a 15-kilogram bomb exploded on the roadside, killing them instantly.

Three other officials were injured in the blast.

Police said the bomb was set off by an electrical wire that extended into a wooded area off the paved road.

The officials were returning from Tambon Lohsaithong, where insurgents had set fire to an elementary school the night before.

The same day in Yala's Yaha district, traveling vendor Marohsalee Loniji, 36, was shot dead while his wife, Yuwahe, also 36, was seriously injured in an attack by suspected insurgents.

A day earlier, Mahyeng Cheteh, 56, was shot dead by gunmen using AK47s as he returned home from evening prayer at a mosque in Tambon Kawa in Narathiwat's Sungai Padi district.

On June 22 three 14-yearold boys were killed and about 10 other people injured in an attack on a teashop in Yala.

Police said suspected insurgents opened fire on the teashop in Baan Thamnob Village Bannang Sata district about 9:10 pm.

The three people killed were identified as Rusalan Ruding, Marolima Senglaroh and Imrol Sengsoh.

Five schools in Songkhla's Saba Yoi district and one school

in Yala were also victims of arson attacks that day. Insurgents also detonated a bomb, destroying two power poles on the Yala-Bannang Sata road in Muang district.

School strife: More than 500 parents and students of a school in Nakhon Sri Thammarat marched in protest June 20 against the school director's order to have each student buy at least one Jatukham Ramathep amulet produced on behalf of the school.

The rally began at 7 am with protesters verbally attacking Seri

Sripakphraek, director of Phra Phrome Phitthayanusorn School, through loudspeakers.

They accused him of questionable ethics and demanded his resignation.

The protest ended when K. Seri arrived and said that he would apply for a school transfer.

The parents said that K. Seri and his wife had ordered the production of 500 amulets using the name of the school without permission from the parents-teachers' association.

They said his order to make each of the 500 students buy an amulet at 599 baht was very inappropriate.

A student said K. Seri had also ordered each student in the upper high-school classes to sell 50 certificates for regular amulets, and another 50 certificates for a special Jatukham Ramathep edition that would soon be produced at 1,499 baht in return for a 20% sales commission.

Parents of those in the highschool classes initially complied with the order, given June 15, but later changed their minds and mobilized to remove K. Seri.

K. Seri has been trans-

ferred to a temporary post at a regional education office in the province.

At the request of the parents, the school's board agreed to stop producing the amulets using the school's name and replaced some of the teachers who were close to K. Seri and involved in the production of the amulets

Nasty novice: A thirteen-yearold novice monk has been arrested for the June 18 murder of an 11-year-old boy during a robbery at a shop in Phatthalung prov-

"Nui" (not his real name) was arrested June 21 by Phatthalung Muang District Police in his native Yala Province as he was trying to re-ordain as a novice monk at a temple in Yala City.

According to police, Nui then confessed to having stabbed to death Natthawon Temdee in the grocery store owned by the victim's grandmother.

Nui also confessed to stealing 5,000 baht in cash and a Yamaha Mio motorcycle from the store. He is now being held at Phatthalung Juvenile Observation and Protection Center.

Natthawon's body was found in the shop's toilet, he had been stabbed more than 10 times. Next to the body police found a monk's robe and a 40-centimeter-long Sparta knife.

Nui reportedly told police that he had originally intended to rob the store with two friends, but they had second thoughts and backed out leaving him to commit the crime alone.

Anonymous ashes: Police in Phatthalung are trying to identify the body of a man found burned beyond recognition near an irrigation canal June 17.

At the scene, police led by Lt Col Suranan Chopngam found a pile of ashes containing human remains. Next to the ashes police collected four 9mm bullet cases, a pair of flip flops and a scorched wrist watch.

The remains were taken for examination at Phatthalung Hospital. Doctors said that they were likely to be from a 35- to 40-year-old man between 165 and 170 centimeters tall.

Witnesses reported seeing a pickup pull up at the scene followed by the sound of four gunshots. They then saw flames rise up and the pickup speeding away.

Police say they believe there were at least two killers and they are likely to have tricked the victim into getting into the truck with them before driving him to a remote spot to kill him and dispose of the evidence.

he National Legislative Assembly (NLA) has passed a bill that removes any loopholes for a man or a woman to escape being charged with rape.

When the draft law is enacted, a woman can face rape charges and a husband can be punished for sexually violating his wife.

Current law defines a rapist as "a person who rapes a woman who is not his wife," thus tacitly granting impunity to a husband who rapes his wife.

In the bill, the definition of rape has a broader scope and includes female offenders. Many NLA members insisted there was evidence that a female could rape a male. The definition is also broad enough to convict homosexual rapists.

Under current laws, no female defendant can appear before the courts to face rape charges

Natee Teerarojjanapongs, director of the Thai Political Gay Group, said many gay men were raped by women known as "fag hags".

The term, which originated in the US, refers to women who associate mostly or exclusively with gay men either because they like their company or are sexually attracted to gay men.

"After the rape takes place, these women demand that the gay men marry them to show responsibility. Some gay men agree to the demand," he said.

The bill has prescribed a jail term of up to 20 years in prison and a maximum fine of 40,000 baht for a convicted rapist.

Debit by degree: A total of 2.67 billion baht owed by students to the Income Contingency Loan (ICL) fund has not been paid, fund manager Thittima Wichairat said.

K. Thittima called on the 1.8 million students involved to make an effort to repay their loans before July 5. If they can not, they should contact ICL offices or Krung Thai Bank, which granted the loans, to discuss debt leniency plans.

A total of 2.7 million students have obtained around 230 billion baht in loans from ICL since its establishment in 1996. Overdue payments will be subject to a 12% fine for those that are a year late, and 18% for two years late.

Suwimol Jiraphatsakul, a senior KTB official, urged ICL debtors to keep in constant contact with the bank to benefit from its leniency options rather than face lawsuits.

Perilous pineapple patrol: A wild elephant from the Kui Buri National Park in Prachuap Khiri Khan attacked and severely injured a farmer guarding a pineapple orchard.

Pracha Kasemsukpaisan, 44, sustained broken ribs and a broken pelvis, but is recovering following surgery. He managed to crawl 500 meters to make a cell-phone call to his brother for help after the attack.

NLA closes loopholes in law on rape

K. Pracha said he was at a makeshift hut guarding his 16-rai pineapple orchard in Tambon Hat Kham the night of June 18 when he heard a noise and discovered a big elephant foraging. He shone a spotlight at the elephant and drove it away.

He was patrolling the orchard again at 5 am the next day when the same elephant suddenly charged him and stomped his torso and pelvis. After the elephant retreated, K. Pracha struggled for two hours to reach his hut to call his brother.

It's official: After three years, a Karen man acquitted in 2004 of shooting up a school bus in Ratchaburi has won his fight for Thai citizenship.

Following evidence checks and witness interviews, Kaeng Krachan District Chief Chuchat Petchprathumkamol on June 19 added Zaw Bi's name to the household registration of Bang Klob villager Niran Pongthep, with whom he built a shared home.

Thai citizenship to Zaw Bi, who was born on Thai soil to a Thai mother but had no documentary evidence to prove it.

Authorities would consider granting citizenship for his wife and children later on, the clerk said.

Zaw Bi became well-known after he was acquitted in March 2004 of controversial murder charges over the shooting of a school bus at Ratchaburi in 2002.

Even parents of the victims had said he was innocent and was being used as a scapegoat by police.

Dangling dolls: Though some motorists feel the authorities would do better to focus on other traffic violations, the Chiang Mai Transport Office will crack down on the recent trend of drivers hanging cute dolls underneath vehicles by fining offenders up to 2,000 baht, effective July 1.

Chiang Mai Transport Chief Chanchai Kilapaeng said that hanging dolls underneath vehicles – done following the Japanese belief that any evil spirits on the road will possess the dolls instead of harming the drivers – might cause road accidents and was against the law.

Chiang Mai motorist Natthanan Wongleukiart, 24, urged the authority to do something more productive, such as cracking down on cars playing loud music and drivers using mobile phones or dodging vehicle tax.

Rapist arrested: Police in Chiang Mai on June 24 arrested an electrician for raping and robbing a Japanese woman in her home in April.

Hang Dong police also ar-

rested Angkhana Jaikhajad, the wife of suspected rapist Suthas, on a charge of knowingly possessing valuables stolen from the unnamed rape victim. The crime took place late at night at the victim's home on April 22.

Valuables worth 92,000 baht and a motorcycle were stolen.

Police said Suthas had confessed to the crimes and that the 25-year-old, also wanted on previous charges of theft and robbery, had recently been released from prison on a drug-related conviction.

Angkhana confessed to illegally possessing the valuables but said she knew nothing about the robbery and the rape.

Crackdown looms: Advertising billboards, placards and banners nationwide will be strictly regulated to ensure efficient consumer-protection measures and provocation-free content, PM's Office Minister Khunying Dhipavadee Meksawan said on June 22.

Provincial authorities and the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) will soon coordinate with the Office of the Consumer Protection Board (OCPB) to work out measures to impose strict regulations on advertisers.

A large percentage of billboards erected alongside interprovince roads and city streets had obstructed views, causing a risk of accidents.

Many signboards also carry sexually oriented material, which is potentially against the law.

The measures will be jointly regulated by the Office of Natural Resources and Environmental Policy and Planning (Onep) within the next six months.

move away from such a locale and focus solely on meeting the needs of our customers," he added

"Our customer base here in Phuket is roughly 80% foreign-

ers who have bought bikes in the past and about 20% Thais and first-time foreign buyers, as well as, customers who have placed orders through the Internet.

"This is our second shop and we chose Phuket to serve this established market. Many of our customers have bought property here and, in the past, we have received requests for us to open a shop here. Now, we can provide them with the service they want at a location that is much more convenient for them," he said.

"If it is a limited-edition, fully-restored model from the 1930s, then we can do our best to meet your needs, but it may take some time," said K. Alex.

The shop also imports brand-name parts and accessories, so it can supply the necessary parts to keep your bike running strong or the custom stylings to make your hog stand out from the others.


Teera's efficiency in meeting customers' orders is aided by the respect it shows to its competitors and the shop's willingness to assist them when needed. K. Alex said that his shop can fulfill a competitor's request if the product is in stock. 






Denmark's Katrine Madsen has been recording delicately-crafted romantic jazz for just over a decade and has toured extensively throughout the world. She is on tour to promote her latest album, *Supernatural Love*, and is backed by the Django d'Or prize-winning Jesper Bodilsen Trio.

How are you doing and what have you been up to recently?

I'm doing just fine and I have been busy for the past few months performing in Denmark, Sweden, England and the US. So What Films has been documenting the concerts throughout the tour and the footage that they capture will result in a live DVD to be released in July. The DVD will feature a live concert and bonus material including interviews, behind the scenes happenings and more

How would you describe your style of jazz?

First and foremost, it is vocal jazz that includes songs I have written and interpretations of songs that I've selected from different musical genres such as jazz, Latin, pop and so on. I arrange the cover songs so they reflect the soft, melodic and intimate sound that I enjoy the most.

Your new album is comprised mostly of cover versions. Who chooses the songs and which is your favorite?

All of the songs are chosen by myself. While I cherish all of the selections on *Supernatural Love*, my favorite would be "Can't Buy Me Love", written by The Beatles.

How do you approach a new interpretation of the classic songs you cover?

The lyrics are very important. I try not to listen to other versions or interpretations of the song before I have crafted my own. That makes it easier for me to find my own way into the song. It is also very important to make a new arrangement that gives the

song a fresh new life which inspires both myself and the band to improvise.

Tell us about the three songs you wrote. What are they about and what was your inspiration?

The song "Supernatural Love" is a duet that was co-written by Caecilie Norby. I wrote the music and then I gave the directions for the lyrics. The song is constructed as a conversation between two women who talk about their relationships with their respective husbands.

The unusual thing about it is that both women are happily married, which brings warmth to the song. The twist is that their female friends always complain about their relationships and they don't understand how other couples can be so happy.

The song "August Roses" is about being in the middle of your life and discovering that life is only lived once. The four seasons reflect the seasons of a lifetime. Spring is childhood and youth, summer is adult and family life, autumn is the maturity and wisdom you have obtained through a long life and winter is the ending of life.

"Witness" is a song I wrote to my son Anton and it describes the gratitude of giving birth and being a witness to his life.

Do you feel there is a difference between singing your own songs and the cover versions?

No, for me there is no difference between the two. I put forth all my energy for both styles.

What goes through your head when you are performing?

I give 100% concentration on the music and on being in the present moment.

Who are your idols?

The pianist Bill Evans, the vocalist/trumpet player Chet Baker and the vocalist Shirley Horn are among my all-time favorites.

Some critics have compared you with Billie Holiday. How does that make you feel?

Billie Holiday was the first great jazz vocalist and everyone who sings jazz stands on the foundation she built. Critics often like





The devolution of Man




From this brief survey you can see that the search for male identity is a confusing minefield and things would be so much easier if nature gave clear instructions, as are supplied to most females.


But nature, or to use her full title, Mother Nature, is very much female and without question she is a cunning and brilliantly intelligent force.

It's not just coincidence that males are continually seeking to find their identities while out and about trying to spread their seed. In fact it is all a carefully-formulated plan of Madame Nature's.



FAMILY RUNABOUT

modest-yet-versatile people carrier that is fast becoming popular on the roads of Phuket is the Toyota Avanza. It is surprisingly spacious and, probably best of all, very affordable.

Powered by a 1.5-liter DOHC engine, the Avanza is never going to set the road afire but it can reach speeds in excess of 160kmh, and it achieves excellent fuel economy. Maximum power is 107bhp (78kW) while the torque output is a respectable 140Nm at 4,400rpm.

Mated to either a five-speed manual or four-speed automatic transmission, it is necessary to use the lower ratios to achieve

brisk acceleration, particularly up and down some of Phuket's hills.

The interior is well appointed, with rear seats that fold down individually or completely flat to form a huge luggage area. While not luxurious the

Avanza is comfortable and versatile. It accommodates seven passengers in three rows of seats, and there are many storage compartments throughout the cabin.

Three-point seat belts are fitted to the outer seats of the the highest-paid driver following second row of seats, as well as the front seats, while the middle seat of the second row has a lap

A reader recently wrote in saying he was "surprised Toyota only fits one airbag to the Hilux pickup", reviewed in this column in mid-May. Well, once again Toyota appears to be pennypinching and the Avanza has only a driver's side airbag.

In this age of safety consciousness, it does seem a little strange that a simple protective device such as a passenger-side airbag, and even side and curtain bags, are omitted from a popular

family runabout. The European Hilux has dual airbags, but the Thai-built version does not; even as an option. Airbags have been proven to save lives and the latest dual-stage bags even detect the severity of an accident and inflate accordingly. Perhaps someone at Toyota would care to comment?

Toyota has recently overtaken General Motors to become the world's most prolific automaker. In the first quarter of 2007, Toyota's sales were up by 9% on 2.35 million vehicles compared with GM's 2.26 mil-

The Japanese manufacturer is on course to achieve sales

> of 9.4 million vehicles this year, with GM in second place on 9.1 million.

However, Toyota is doing rather less well in Formula 1. Having entered the top echelon of the sport in 2002, it has yet to win a race let alone

the world championship. The Cologne-based team reputedly has the largest budget of any F1 team, rumored to be north of 17.25 billion baht a year.

Ralf Schumacher is now the retirement of his brother at the end of last season. Teammate Jarno Trulli earns but a fraction of Schumacher's takehome package, thought to be in the region of 620 million baht a year.

Ralf's contract is up at the end of this season, but it is believed that Toyota regards him highly enough to extend it for a further three years.

Grand Prix insiders are at a loss to know why, as rarely does the younger Schumacher demonstrate any race-winning ability and there are plenty of younger and cheaper – drivers who could and perhaps should take over the Toyota seat for 2008.

But back to the humble Avanza. It is well equipped: a decent audio system, complete indash CD player; rear screen wiper and the latest new-fangled dials, of which Toyota is so proud.


This little Toyota is imported into Thailand rather than being built here – unlike the Hilux, which is assembled at Toyota's

LEONARD LOSES IT

ovelists are conveniently classified into two groups: literary and commercial. John Updike, Philip Roth and Joyce Carol Oates write for the ages. The late Harold Robbins, Leon Uris and Joan Collins write for money, lots of it. But there are gray areas. How would you classify Arthur Conan Doyle of Sherlock Holmes fame? Or Arthur C. Clarke or Isaac Asimov in science fiction? Or John LeCarré, for that

A crime writer who is so good that he teeters into literature is Elmore Leonard. Years ago, distinguished literary writers were polled by the New York Times about whether they ever read commercial fiction. The name that came up most often was Elmore Leonard.

Pushing 80, the author of 43 novels, Leonard started out as a writer of Westerns, then moved to modern-day crime thrillers.

In the process he honed his craft to the point where his hip conversational style, and especially his dialog, became instantly recognizable. Other comical crime writers such as Carl Hiaasen are obviously in his debt.

His great early crime novels worked on an axis between southern Florida and Detroit, his hometown.

In his previous novel, he moved back back in time to Depression-era Oklahoma.




Morrow, New York, 2007, 292pp) takes place during World War II.

The hero of his previous book, The Hot Kid, Deputy Federal Marshall Carl Webster, famed killer of bank robbers, is sent from Oklahoma to Detroit to catch two German POWs who have escaped during the last days of World War II.

Now there's great Elmore Leonard and good Elmore Leonard but never bad Elmore Leonard – until now. Up in Honey's Room is just awful. It's written in a parody of the famed Leonard style. The main problem is that the villains of the piece, a Nazi spy ring, are such a weak and foolish bunch. Leonard's normally very good with villains but these are so dim and witless you just don't care whether they get their comeuppance or not.

This is not to say that the novel does-His latest, *Up in Honey's Room* (William n't have a slam bang opening and a couple



intriguing opening chapters. The old man hasn't lost his touch there. The novel starts with a phone call between Honey Deal in Detroit and her sister-in-law Muriel back in her hometown in Kentucky.

Honey describes in very funny terms the husband she is about to abandon, a German-American named Walter Schoen, a humorless Nazi supporter who believes he is the twin of Henrich Himmler. The date is November 1939.

Six years later, she's visited by FBI agent Kevin Dean, who's on the track of a Nazi spy ring. Carl Webster comes into

the picture chasing two escaped German POWs. And so the plot is set.

Carl enlists Honey's help in finding Jurgen Schrenk, a tank veteran of the Afrika Korps, whom he believes Walter Schoen is hiding. The other POW, SS Major Otto Penzler, improbably enough, skips off to Cleveland with a Jewish black market art dealer. They meet in a department store bookshop and the dialog goes like this:

He said, "Tell me your name." She said, "I'm Aviva Freeman."

"Really?" Otto said. "You're a Jewess?'

"And you're a Kraut, a Nazi?"

"I'm an officer in the SS," Otto said, wanting to smile.

Aviva said, "Oh dear."

There's plenty of great dialog in this book but the flimsy plot hinges on a harebrained scheme by Walter Schoen to crash a private plane into Franklin D. Roosevelt's Little White House in Georgia on Adolf Hitler's birthday but Roosevelt dies before-

The plot is further frittered away by aimless dialog among minor characters, including Countess Vera Mezwa Radzykewycz, the Ukranian head of the spy ring, and her murderous transvestite lover Bohdan Kravachenko.

And so you trudge on to the end, just waiting for it to be over. This is a page turner in the worst sense.



Rollin' on

As regular *Gazette* readers know, Phuket is a gold mine for a lucky few – and heartbreak for many others.

Just as in the boomtowns of America's Wild West, the all-out rush for wealth on the island has come at a steep price: mostly environmental degradation and a breakdown in social structure.

Although no part of the island has escaped this trend, nowhere is it more pronounced than in Patong, where trinket vendors share the sidewalks with prostitutes, touts, beggars, sex tourists and families on package holidays.

The big winners in Patong have been a very small segment of its population, mostly local landowners who have seen their family fortunes skyrocket to levels unimaginable a few decades ago. On the other side of the coin, look what has become of their banana plantation paradise.

In any boomtown vices such as gambling, prostitution and theft tend to be rampant – in Patong they are actually part of the draw.

In his farewell to Patong after two-and-a-half-years as Kathu Police Superintendent, Col Teeraphol Thipjaroen [see First Person, facing page] outlines his accomplishments, while admitting the need for more improvements.

Known as a tough-yet-fair cop during his 12 years with Phuket City Police Station's Traffic Division, it is not surprising that Col Teeraphol used that experience to improve the traffic situation in Patong, first by banning vehicular traffic from Soi Bangla at night and then with the introduction of a one-way traffic system.

While such changes may have seemed easy to bring about to the casual observer, they are no small achievement in a place like Patong, where the vested interests of a powerful few have time and again trumped the needs of the millions of tourists who visit each year and find themselves without access to such basic facilities as free public toilets or reasonably-priced public transport.

With that in mind, perhaps it is fortunate that Col Teeraphol's replacement is Pol Col Kritsak Songmulnak, whose last post was as Superintendent of the Tourist Police Region 1 office in Bangkok.

Responsible in that position for the safety of tourists at locations as The Temple of the Emerald Buddha and the infamous Khaosarn Rd, little is known about him in Phuket thus far, except that he speaks English very well.

While that is positive news for Patong, it will take more than linguistic skill to maintain and build on Col Teeraphol's successes.

In the meantime, bar owners in Patong will no doubt be keeping close watch to see what crackdowns, if any, the new police chief will unleash to mark his arrival.



While schools should take such measures to protect their children from stalkers, miscreants and fellow students and teachers who might harm, cases like that of Virginia Tech student-from-hell Seung-Hui Cho are one-in-a-billion occurrences and impossible to predict or prevent

To protect our students here in Phuket, a much better place to start would not be on the school grounds but on our public roads. This would mean taking a hard look at school transport.

Hardly a day passes when I don't see uniformed students

hanging by one arm from speeding pickups, tuk-tuks or even perched precariously on motor-bikes, invariably without helmets.

It seems that in Thailand it is only after a tragedy that common-sense steps are taken to prevent a recurrence.

Why not be pro-active and prevent them in the first place? If we don't, I am afraid it will only be a matter of time before a real tragedy will occur.

Baby murder harks back to Bulger boys

I was sickened and saddened to read about young Nitchanart, who at just two years old had her throat slit by teenagers [see News pages, and "Toddler killed in botched burglary", *Gazette* online June 23].

My heart goes out to Nitchanart's parents, and to the family of Dang Panthip, the nanny who died after also having her throat cut by the boys.

Memories of the Jamie Bulger case in the UK in 1993 came back to haunt me. I can only pray that the two teenagers who murdered Nitchanart do not receive the same "Western justice" as Jon Venables and Robert Thompson have – they have been released after serving only eight years of their jail sentence and one of them is reportedly going on to university to further his career prospects.

There are reasons why I have chosen to call Phuket my home. That events like this do *not* happen here is one of them.

Patong's top cop moves on

started working here in Patong in October, 2004. It was my first time working in the capacity of superintendent and I didn't expect to have to change the administrative system at the Kathu Police Station very much, as it was already regarded as one of the best and most important stations in Police Region 8.

Before I was stationed here I worked for 12 years with the Traffic Division of the Phuket City Police, so I was already very familiar with Phuket.

Patong's problems are similar to those in other parts of Thailand where the tourism industry has boomed. The local population and their elected officials have trouble adjusting to the fast pace of development and the rapid influx of capital. In such cases there will always be some opposition, especially from people who cannot adjust their visions and ideas.

In the past, Patong was a very quiet area. People went about their lives in a quiet, peaceful way. There were very few restrictions and little law enforcement was required.

Unlike now, when traffic has become a problem, there were no problems with car and motorcycle rental operators lining up their vehicles along the beach. Parking was not much of a problem, because there weren't many vehicles on the road.

After the increase in the number of tourists visiting and lack of parking, people look at the vehicle rental operators and ask: 'Why do they get the right to have reserved parking?

After two and a half years as Superintendent of Kathu Police, Col Teeraphol Thipjaroen, 47, was recently transferred to serve as Superintendent of Krabi's Koh Lanta Police Station. Here he reflects on his trials, tribulations and successes while working in Patong.



The situation is similar on the beach among beach chair operators. In the past, locals noticed tourists coming to the beach had nothing to sit on and and had little protection from the sun, so a small cottage industry sprang up to cater to their needs. Now that industry has become big business, with competitors vying for space on the beach.

These are just two of the more obvious problems arising from Patong's rapid development, but there are others and it is up to the police not simply to enforce the law with an iron fist but to work together with the community to create a new vision that everyone can live with.

When I started to working here I knew there were many problems and conflicts and I realized that the best solutions wouldn't come solely through strict law enforcement. It would also required a deep understanding of how the problems and conflicts developed in the first place.

When I was transferred here, I tried to work with all sides and not pick a fight with any single party. I would say we have made good progress in some areas and that the overall situation has improved, but there is still a great deal of work left to do in other areas.

In my first year working

here, Patong was hit with torrential downpours and flooding. Then came the tsunami. I knew that making Patong recover would be a huge undertaking.

Many people hate police, but when the crisis hit it proved that we were willing to work hard with no benefit to ourselves in return. We get no special benefits, not even a personal gasoline allowance, yet we are always happy to come to the assistance of local residents and tourists

During the tsunami, I stayed here in Patong for three months straight, never returning home and taking part in all the post-tsunami activities and events.

It was tiring, because we had so many VIPs coming here and we had to provide security for them as well as help in the recovery. Before the tsunami, we were able to tackle problems as they arose without too much difficulty, but after the tsunami there seemed to be no end to the number of orders the police were assigned to carry out.

Anyway, I am proud of how well we did during those very trying times.

Another accomplishment I can point to upon leaving is the successful transformation of Soi Bangla into a pedestrian walkway by night. It had been talked about for years before and everybody said it could never be done because so many people with vested interests were against it.

In fact, Soi Bangla should have been established as a pedestrian walkway [by night] long before we were able to successfully do so in 2005. Pedestrians need to be able to walk safely through the area at night. Also, banning motorcycles from the street after dark improves security and minimizes the risk of someone planting a bomb.

No less than two days after

motorcycle taxi and and tuk-tuk drivers staged a protest. They parked their vehicles around the police station and complained that their livelihoods had been adversely affected because they could no longer pick up fares on Soi Bangla as they used to.

It was true that I was focused solely on security matters and had forgotten to consider how their interests would be affected by the change.

I apologized to them for that, then we all sat down together and quickly worked out designated zones exclusively for tuk-tuk and motorcycle taxi parking. I don't think they are a 'mafia', they just wanted a workable solution to the problem.

The last big change I established during my tenure was introducing the one-way traffic system, which had also talked about for years but never successfully implemented.

After it started, traffic began to flow more freely, the number of accidents fell and there were fewer problems with parking. Still, there were many who were opposed to it, but we managed to address some of their concerns once again through a series of meetings.

Finally we held a survey and learned that 60% of the people were in favor of the new system. We also asked for public input on how to make further improvements to the new sys-

It is a big change and that is why it has taken some people time to adapt. We need to improve signs, road markings and other infrastructure to support it, but I think one-way is here to stay. We need to have it and there is no need to conduct an endless series of public hearings about

Patong can continue to improve, but we need strong and brave people in order to implement the needed changes.

People might look at my record and say I didn't achieve much, but I have been able to introduce some new measures that nobody in the past had been brave enough to push through.

Others might look down on my achievements as limited only to traffic control, but I am satisfied with my overall management and leadership record in a number of areas.

Patong cannot change overnight, so we need to adopt a series of reasonable improvements

In the end, however, the success or failure of Patong rests with the people who live here.

My new assignment is in Koh Lanta, which resembles Patong as it was 15 years ago. I will do my best to use my experience here in Patong to help it develop in the best way possible.

Planting the seeds of change

n the past six months my office has became a stop for travel academics studying the post-tsunami development of the Andaman Triangle of Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi.

These folks did their research before coming to Thailand, so they knew what to expect, but as thorough academics, they had to see the development of the area for themselves – and they were not impressed.

If this sounds gloom and doom, forget it. There is still hope in the form of the prestigious Thailand Environmental Institute (TEI) and the fact that about a dozen new Phuket and Phang Nga five-star hotels are from responsible chains including Shangri-La, Four Seasons, Raffles, Six Senses and Oriental.

I've known and worked with TEI's Dr Chamniern Vorratnchaiphan since the early 90s, inspecting most black water canals and undersized sewage treatment plants in Southern Thailand.

Dr Chamniern works throughout Southeast Asia, taking his Model Cities program to countries including Vietnam and the Philippines, but now he's emphasizing planning and ecotourism in the South with projects

icrosoft has been touting its Office suite as a productivity enhancer for at least 10 years. On a consulting job for a huge multinational company that I finished one year ago, I was using Windows 2000 and Office 97 up to the very last day. Not one single time in two years did I say, "Damn, I wish I could upgrade to the newest version of Office to increase my productivity." And I probably used no more than 20% of the feature set ei-

However, I did stumble across a productivity enhancer about six months ago: using two monitors (also called displays) on the same computer. I am still beating myself over the head for not discovering it sooner, and I know I'll never look back.

ther.

In essence, the viewing space is doubled and it's almost the same as having a display that is twice the width. When I have to write a report or produce a document for which I have to pull in information from many different files, it's maddening to have layer upon layer of documents to wade through on one screen. With two screens side by side, there can be a method to the madness and after you get used to it, you will develop positive, habit-forming organizational concepts to meet the structure.

For instance, I have two email programs open all day; Outlook and a Web browser with at least one Web-based email account. Since I glance at it from time to time, that goes on the second display, to the right of the first one where it doesn't clog up my main display.

When I am composing a document or writing up a report, I type in the main window while I keep all of my reference files opened and nicely layered in the right display. That way I can copy and paste with ease into my main document from the source files.

Also, if you are watching a video, a slide presentation or the

progress of a sports game where you have to glance at it occasionally, this is a perfect candidate for the second display. For my work I have to watch training videos in LiveMeeting replays (Powerpoint slides with audio, and quite boring), so the secondary display is the perfect place for this, as I have no interruption to my main

I will describe how to set this up in Windows XP. I am using XP Pro, but I assume that the setup is almost exactly the same for XP Home, Windows 2000 or the newly-released Vista. I know it can be done in Linux and I have two laptops with different distributions (Fedora Core 6 and openSUSE 10.2), so if you have problems setting it up in Linux, shoot me an email at the address below and I'll do all I can to help

– but, as a Linux user, you know that jumping through a few hoops to get anything done is standard practice. In the Linux world, using two monitors is called "Dual Head". For Mac users, I profusely apologize for not being able to help you yet, but in the next month or so I will be getting OS X up and running.

The key is to have a graphics card that can support two displays or have two graphics cards. On a laptop, it's easy because all of them I know of have a second video card; even my circa-2002 Dell Latitude 2650 has a second video card and supports dual head monitoring. On a desktop PC, you will need a graphics card with two connectors (in technical jargon, called DB-9 female connectors) or two graphics cards. A second graphics card should be cheap to buy (1,500 baht), and with Windows' Plug'n' Play capability and driver support, it should be a piece of cake to install.

Last week, I picked up a secondhand 17-inch color monitor at the first second-hand computer store I have found in Phuket City for 1,900 baht; if you are a bargain hunter and/or bartering expert (which I am not), you can get one for less. If you have the cash, you can spring for a flat-screen display but I find them far too expensive in Phuket. You'll be paying about 4,000 baht to save one square foot of real estate on your work area.

Back to the Windows XP configuration:

There are two ways to get to the configuration page: 1. The easiest: right-click on the desktop, click on Properties to bring

up the Display Properties page, then click on the Settings tab; 2. Click the Start button, go to Settings, then Control Panel, then click on Display.

At this point, you have to have the second monitor's adapter cord plugged in and have it powered on, or your settings will not take hold when you enable it. You should see two squares with #2 grayed out. If you don't, then you aren't supporting two monitors and you need to call tech support (which these days means using Google search, which will be the subject of an upcoming article) and stop reading here. If you see two squares, right click on #2, click on Attach and a check mark should appear to the left of it. Click OK.

Next, if all goes according to plan, the wallpaper of your main display should be duplicated on the second display and you are in business. Now you can open programs and files, and move them from left to right on the second monitor.

The Windows taskbar remains on the main display (or, at least, I haven't tried to move it to the second display). If you are

> One other advantage of dual monitors that I haven't men-

tioned is that you can set the display resolution of the second monitor to be different than the main display (in the same Settings tab page, select the second monitor and change the screen resolution). This is great if you have a game or educational program that recommends a certain display resolution, or if your eyes get a little tired at night – like mine do – so you can reduce the display resolution and make it easier to read documents. Plus, changing resolution on the second monitor saves you the pain of realigning all your desktop icons when you change resolutions back and forth.

I promise you that once you start working with two displays, you'll be hooked forever.





Italian dental supply firm to set up RHQ in Phuket

he dentistry market in Phuket has grown exponentially in recent years, mirroring the increase in discount medical procedures in Thailand.

To sustain and benefit from the growth of dental clinics in Phuket, the dental supply company Mectron has set up a regional headquarters (RHQ) in Phuket for selling and servicing its products in Asia.

The Italian-based company has offices across Europe and Canada, and now plans to open a Phuket branch in July to use as a supply hub for all of Asia.

Regional Manager of Mectron Asia/Pacific Norbert Emmerich said the company is keen

to take advantage of Phuket's status as a tourism and conference center for Southeast Asia.

Key to the decision to move into Phuket was its international airport and high-quality conference venues and hotels, which allow visiting clients to stay comfortably, said Mr Emmerich.

Mectron, founded in 1979, specializes in the manufacture and distribution of custom dental equipment.

Mr. Emmerich outlined the market plan for the new subsidiary, saying, "With any product, not just consumer products, you have to focus on more than just the product itself and the pricing; it's about after-sales service, the service behind the product.

"If you improve this service then your sales will increase likewise. All our competitors are doing it, and so we have to follow suit. We are launching the company in Thailand to serve the Asian and Australian market, and with our levels of service we are expecting to double turnover in two to three years."

But why choose Phuket as a location for the RHQ over other, larger cities?

Mr Emmerich explained, "I think Phuket is the ideal place to set up a subsidiary in Southeast Asia. It is expensive when our shipments come from overseas to Bangkok and then get sent on to Phuket.

"Also, we have found that our customers only complain if our products cannot be repaired by a local partner. This would normally mean they have to ship their equipment back to Italy, which nobody wants to do because it is so expensive."

With the low cost of setting up an office in Thailand, the financial burden is much lower than performing a similar operation in Europe.

"If you look at other companies such as Acer, Sony and Compaq, they have all launched services in Phuket because it is such an important market.



Norbert Emmerich expects to see turnover in Asia double in two to three years.

"To improve the quality of our product, we need to convince more people to start using it in the first place, which is what you see these other companies doing here. By being based in Phuket we will not just be serving the Thai market, but the whole region," he said.

"Our products have been available in the market for several years. Customer feedback has been good.

"People like our equipment and they like the technology we offer in terms of design, appearance and the working experience of the machines." One of the products Mectron manufactures is bone-cutting units for micro-bone surgery, and several years ago the company invented new technology which uses ultrasound in surgery.

The advantage of using ultrasound for bone surgery is that the instruments are able to cut part of the tissue and bone without causing damage to any soft tissue.

This is especially useful if a surgeon needs to cut bone in a delicate area, such as near blood vessels, nerves or membranes.

Before ultrasound technology was available, surgeons used drills, which did not allow for a selective cut and would cut both hard and soft tissue.

The high technology and resulting high cost of the units offered by Mectron means that the company's customers tend to be large hospitals and dental establishments where there is a demand for delicate surgery.

Due to the specialized nature of the products, sales are not high in volume.




Private clinics in Phuket have yet to use Mectron products, although they are used by dentists in Chiang Mai, Haad Yai and Bangkok.

After one year in the Thai market, Mectron is likely to expand, said Mr Emmerich, because it is the only company locally offering this kind of surgical equipment.

With a subsidiary in Phuket also comes the ability to offer improved service to Southeast Asian and Australian clients.

he Japanese economy, the world's second largest, continues to grow. Revised gross domestic product (GDP) figures issued in June reflect that first quarter growth for 2007 reached an annualized rate of 3.3%. This means that the Japanese economy for that period actually outperformed both the US and the EU.

However, this is probably a flattering figure as growth appears to be slowing and the Central Bank, having raised interest rates to 0.5% earlier this year, is now assessing the situation before implementing any further increases, by August at the earliest. What was unexpected was that the April figures for industrial production saw output fall by 0.2%.

The yen is trading at a fiveyear low against the US dollar and at record lows against the euro. Japan enjoys a large current account surplus and the world's second highest foreign exchange reserves at almost US\$ 1 trillion (34.5 trillion baht), which makes the weak currency something of a contradiction, but low interest rates are keeping any attraction in holding yen at bay.

In addition, the Japanese domestic political situation is of some concern. Shinzo Abe, who became prime minister in September 2006, is being widely criticized for his poor management of the economy.

There is an increasing perception in Japan that the economic reforms undertaken by his predecessor, Junichiro Koizumi, have stalled and Abe is concentrating more on being a global statesman.

Abe is seen to be more interested in changes to the constitution and relationships with China than on issues such as pensions and continued economic reform. This has led to foreign criticism, such as the comment from Richard Jerram, an economist at Macquaries Securities, who stated that Mr Abe's economic policy was "notable by its absence".

Although not his fault, Mr Abe is being widely criticized for the loss, by Japan's Social Security Agency, of 50 million pension records. These records will, presumably, eventually be located but in the interim it has become a major news story in Japan.

While Abe is spending a lot of his time on changes to the constitution, a survey in early June found that 71% of respondents wanted the government to focus on pensions while only 25% rated the constitutional changes as more important.

The popularity of Mr Abe's government has declined sharply. In monthly telephone polls conducted by Japan's daily newspaper, *Asahi Shimbun*, Mr Abe's popularity has plunged from an approval rating of 63% last September to 24% in June.

His perceived mismanagement of the economy is mainly to blame. In fact, the number of respondents who do not support Mr Abe's economic policies have climbed from less than 20% last

September to more than 45% in June.

Elections are scheduled for July 22, when half of the seats in Japan's Upper House are contested. The ruling party, the LDP (Liberal Democratic Party) and its allies control 133 of the Upper House seats out of a total of 242.

Any major loss will see control move to opposition parties, which will make any legislative changes much more difficult. In addition, there is a concern that Mr Abe may have to take political responsibility and resign. This would cause an unwelcome period of uncertainty.

All these factors are helping to extend the life of the "yen carry trade", whereby investors borrow against the yen and invest the proceeds in higher-yielding currencies. The most popular currencies invested were the New Zealand dollar, Australian dollar, sterling and the US dollar.

The main players in these transactions were pension funds seeking higher yields and hedge funds, but increasingly this is spreading to the retail sector – the Japanese public. Nick Parsons, of National Australia Bank, says they will be closely watching

where Japanese employees invest their half-yearly bonuses, payable in July, as they expect another wave of retail investment in the "yen carry trade".



He noted that over the past two years the value of the yen has fallen from 11 South Korean

won to 7.5 won. South Korea, as a major competitor of Japan, is increasingly concerned about the weak Japanese yen as it impacts severely on its competitive position.

The rush of funds from Japan is also causing problems "down under". New Zealand recently raised interest rates to 8% to fight a mixture of strong economic growth and inflationary pressures. This naturally led to a further inflow of Japanese capital into New Zealand's bond markets, resulting in the New Zealand dollar reaching its highest level since the currency was allowed to free float in 1985.

The central bank of New Zealand, called the Reserve Bank of New Zealand, has been selling the local currency to stem the rise in value, but with only limited success. The New Zealand dollar is now at levels that are starting to inhibit exports and threaten the country's vital tourism industry.

No doubt the Reserve Bank of New Zealand will also be watching where Japanese individuals invest their July bonuses.



Phuket gets first badminton courts with rubber floors

PHUKET: Rubber-floored badminton courts have arrived on the island in the form of four deluxe courts at the new Andaman Badminton facilities off Chao Fa East Rd, near the Siam Commercial Bank.

Kanpitcha Srikitjaroenchai, 25, the owner of the courts told the Gazette, "Our courts meet competition requirements. We have four rubber courts and four cement courts. Our target is people who love to play badminton, especially company groups and students. Most of our customers come to play after work, about 6 pm and later.

"We are open every day from 10 am to 10 pm. The fee for the rubber courts is 150 baht per hour; the cement courts go for 100 baht per hour.

I'm fairly sure that annoyances get more annoying as you get older. Does that mean I'm turning into my father? A scary thought, but I'm sure that if I had teenage kids I'd be bursting into their bedrooms screaming at them over the 150-decibel music asking them to "turn that damn noise down".

I find that some accents from various parts of the UK grate too. Apologies to Birmingham readers, but that accent doesn't do you any favors. Somehow the Brummie accent makes the speakers sound as if they're a few bricks short of a full load. I'm sure they're not, but that highpitched back-of-the-throat 'awroyt?' favorite of theirs hardly makes them sound like Mensa candidates.

Some regional accents are fine. Scousers (ladies and gentlemen from Liverpool) are usually comedians, and most utterances from Geordies (Newcastle) are often hilarious. Try saying 'Kawa-sak-i' in a Geordie accent without smiling. You can't.

> And so, inevitably, we move on to the Welsh. Their accent is neither amusing nor charming, unfortunately. Is it just me that finds Welsh accents annoying? They're wonderful in Wales I'm sure, with all their singing in the valleys, but let's work on the exit visa situation.

> And while we're on the subject of the Welsh accent, why is it that whenever I try it, the first couple of sentences come out OK, but then inevitably transform into a very poor attempt at Pakistani? Is it just me?

> The English have a flower for their national emblem – the rose. A thing of beauty. The Welsh? They have two – the daffodil and the leek. I will concede that the daffodil has its charm, but a leek? A smelly vegetable?

> I remember, in my school days, a couple of Welsh kids whose mothers insisted on pinning a leek to their lapels on St David's Day. We obviously made no comment on the stinking vegetable that accompanied them all day. You can imagine how gentle we all were, and how much we admired these fine Welsh chaps attending a Yorkshire school proclaiming their origins.

> I suppose I should move on to the subject of plants at some stage, or I'm likely to be accused of yet another meaningless rant. Much as I hate to admit a fondness for something associated with the Welsh, one of the few plants I miss from my homeland is in fact the daffodil. Most of the others are either too boring or slow-growing, or just plain insignificant. The daffodil at least has some individuality about it.

Phuket is hardly the daffo-

dil capital of the world (it would probably be somewhere in those valleys attached to the west of England) but at least we have something that looks vaguely similar – the clivia miniata, or kaffir lily. The similarity is actually extremely vague, come to think of it. At least they both have that 90-degree flower-on-top-of-thestalk thing happening.

Originally, clivia made its way over here from Natal, South Africa, where it grows naturally in shady, moist areas. The name of the plant isn't the most obvious. Most people probably even pronounce it incorrectly. It was given to the plant by a man named John Lindley during the mid1800s. Lady Clive (really!) was the Duchess of Northumberland then, and Lindley named the plant in her honor. You couldn't make this stuff up.

There are a few different species, but the *clivia miniata* is probably the most common grown here. Its dark green leaves are broad and strap-like and grow in a kind of arch, up to about 40cm long and three to four inches wide. Brilliant clusters of apricot-colored, funnel-shaped blossoms appear on strong stems arising from the center of the dense leaf clumps.

A general rule of thumb is that plants tend to be happier in open soil, rather than being confined to a pot. The *clivia minia*ta bucks that trend completely, as it is much happier when its roots much, anyway. Dydd da to you.

are constricted by a small pot, for some bizarre reason. Try to resist the temptation to move the plant to a larger pot as you would do for most potted plants. This one's a serious masochist. If it were human it would probably be into things that should definitely be conducted behind closed

Clivia roots are thick, fleshy and very well-equipped for water storage. On a mature plant, the swollen mass of roots often becomes so large that it will completely fill the pot, forcing the soil in the pot up and over the container's edge. Only when this begins to happen should a clivia plant be moved to a larger pot.

Unlike many other plants, clivias survive in bright or dim light and in soil that is moist or dry. They prefer well-drained, organic soil in bright light with early morning or late afternoon sun and shaded in between, as the leaves will scorch if they get direct sun. It may have masochistic tendencies, but heat isn't among its plea-

The ability of these plants to survive under conditions unsuitable for most other plants makes them extremely tough house plants and ideal candidates for people who like to have plants in their houses, but can't be bothered giving them much attention.

Clivias are most often propagated by separation of offsets, or the extra stalks that grow independently from the main plant, after the plants have flowered. When an individual offset has developed three or four leaves of its own, it can be cut from the parent plant (you need to include some roots too) and placed in small pots of its own.

Daffodils may not exactly be abundant here, but at least we make do with this distant relative. Those of the Welsh persuasion can be reassured that should they feel the urge to pin a clivia miniata to their chests at the beginning of March every year, we won't snigger at all. Well, not







ork on the Phuket Thani project on 25 rai on Thepkrasat tri Rd, just north of the Heroines Monument, is now 50% complete. About 70% of the project has been sold and local developers Collage Height Estate Co Ltd and Siam Island Property Co Ltd expect to complete all

50% complete. About 70% of the construction by the end of 2008.

The project has 46 three-story commercial units in eight blocks, 24 two-story home-office units in four blocks, 34 duplex

houses and 46 single houses.

Can Patong reinvent itself?

veryone has an opinion on Patong. Either they love it or hate it, but there is never a lack sentiment when the subject comes up. No matter what you think of the place, no one can deny Patong's significance to the tourism economy and its role as the meeting point for island visitors. Strategically, it remains a hub where north, south, east and west col-

After the tsunami, the area started making noises about rejuvenation and was marked by overseas investment into projects, such as the impressive renovation of the Holiday Inn and the financial rehabilitation of Jungceylon. Local firms were active; Burasari acquired the Comfort Inn and expanded its well-regarded brand.

However, other projects did not move ahead, such as the Sofitel, located on one of the area's prime pieces of real estate at the north end of the bay.

In 2007, the pace of internationally branded hotels opening has been accelerating. There will be more than 1,500 chain-operated rooms coming on line in the next year, including the Millennium at Jungceylon (436 rooms), Mercure (249 rooms) and Ibis (250 rooms).

Perhaps the mostwatched new project is the Park Hyatt Phuket, at Emerald Bay to the south of Patong. This stunning piece of property was

controlled for years by Taiwan's Evergreen group and was sold to Thai and Hong Kong interests. The question on everyone's lips

has been, "Is Patong ready for a high-end luxury resort?" This will be a key indicator if the market can evolve to serve the upperechelon segment.

Transactions remain a barometer of a healthy property market, and there have been two of note lately. First is Destination Properties' acquisition of the Grand Tropicana (400 rooms), which is understood to be under renovation and will be branded for the coming high season.

This is the latest move for Gary Murray's group, which bought the Felix Hotel in Karon and renovated and flagged it as a Ramada, along with Kamala Bay Terrace opening next year as an Alila.

While more recently acquired, the Surin Beach Resort and Kamala Bay Garden Resort are currently under renovation and will be internationally managed. Also of note was the sale

of the boutique Baan Yin Dee project to a company controlled by a Singapore-listed firm, which recently bought Bintan Lagoon Resorts.

Support facilities, such as dining and shopping attractions, are a key component of the development of any market. Jungceylon is well-placed to capture

traffic from most hotels on the island. One key multi-outlet under development within the project is Singapore's Indochine group's tiered entertainment venue, bringing a va-

> riety of eating, drinking and lifestyle offerings.

At the Sky Inn, the 9th Floor restaurant with its impressive refurbishment attracts

tourists and locals alike, and the regional Coyote bar and restaurant at the front of BanThai is adding to the list of chains with outlets in Bangkok that now see Phuket as a "must have" location.

The rate of property development in Patong has lapsed during the past five years, meaning there is a good amount of catchup required. After years being dominated by lower-end products, Patong now has a few notable projects raising the bar, such as BYD Lofts and L'Orchidee's ocean-view villas.

Many industry watchers are waiting to see if, and at what level, a mixed-use residential or villa component will be offered at the Park Hyatt project. Ultimately, given the limited amount of developable land, it appears that Patong's future depends on either bringing down older structures, developing more dense projects or renovating existing products.

From a long-term perspective, and given the number of high-rise buildings already in the area, perhaps one option might be to zone certain areas of Patong to allow for new high-rise developments, taking a similar road of development of the more sophisticated destinations, such as Waikiki.

Once there is no more undeveloped land, either redevelopment needs to be done or else there will be a geographical shift


to areas such as Mai Khao.

With Patong virtually bursting at the seams, Kalim looks poised to be a major area of activity over the next few years. Bart Duykers of Villa Santi recently said that both the boutique resort and its signature outlet, Gaya, with enviable sunset views of the bay, will open by this coming high season.

The multi-million-dollar Dijinnah Santi project is under construction and sales are moving, showing there is a market in that location for a 60- to 100-million-baht property. To be sited on the hills opposite is the Miora Resort, planned to be an all-suite, internationally managed hotel, as well as an up-market dining/bar complex next to Baan Chai Lei.

Patong will remain a source of conversation for a long time, be it good or bad. From a tourism and property perspective, the current trend towards upgrading and branding of products, new developments and the scale of international investment is positive.

Downstream, zoning and regulating growth are going to be paramount to reinventing the destination.
