Former Gov jailed on child-sex charges

BANGKOK (Nation, Kom Chad Luek, TNA): Chalerm Phromlert, who was Phuket Governor from 1987 to 1991, was sent to Pathum Thani Prison November 13 after the Supreme Court upheld his 36-year jail sentence for multiple counts of statutory

Judge Samart Ardnarong handed down the verdict against Chalerm, who was accused of having sex with four schoolgirls aged between 13 and 16 at a motel in a Bangkok suburb from November 2000 to January 2001.

One of the girls testified that she and the other girls willingly engaged in sex with "Pa Chalerm" for 5,000 baht each.

The girls went to him in succession, each spending two or three minutes with him, the court heard.

Chalerm's case came to light after one of the girls, aged 14, failed to return home for two days because she was afraid of what her parents' reaction would be if they learned she had turned to prostitution.

Chalerm's arrest came while he was serving as deputy speaker of the senate, representing Surat Thani province.

In handing down its ruling, the court said Chalerm was

clearly guilty; as a prominent person who knew his actions were illegal, his appeal did not carry sufficient weight to clear him.

In 2002, the Criminal Court found Chalerm guilty of four counts of statutory rape.

After being sentenced to four years in prison for each count, Chalerm posted 1 million baht in assets as bail.

Rather than overturn the decision or reduce the sentence, the Appeals Court in 2005 added

20 years to Chalerm's 16-year sentence – an extra five years for each of the four counts of molestation that the Criminal Court had not factored into its punishment.

Chalerm entered the court November 13 a free man, having been released on 2.5-millionbaht bail pending his appeal to the Supreme Court.

Already in his early 70s, Chalerm now faces spending the rest of his life behind bars.

Key areas stage first **Municipal** elections

PHUKET: The first-ever municipal elections in Rassada, Rawai and Wichit, all upgraded from tambon administration organization (*OrBorTor*) to municipality (tessabaan tambon) status in August, were held November 17.

In Rassada, large crowds amassed at the vote-counting center at Phuket Rajabhat University. Suratin Lian-udom, leader of Raksa Rassada, won 3.264 votes to defeat Preecha Jai-ard of Rassada Prongsai party, with 3,241 votes.

Somchai Duangkae won 2,700 votes and former OrBor-Tor President Sutas Hongboot won 1,716 votes. Voter turnout was 58.7% of the 20,232 eligible

In Rawai, Pattana Rawai leader Aroon Solos won 2,846 votes to hold off Kraiwoot Koombaan, with 2,284 votes. Turnout was 5,526 (66.6 %) out of 8,301 eligible voters.

Officials counting the votes at Muang Phuket School announced the results at 5 am the next day after both candidates agreed to go ahead despite a oneballot discrepancy between the number of voters who signed in and the number of ballots cast.

There was little drama during the vote counting at the Wichit Municipality Office, as incumbent OrBorTor President Kreetar Saetan ran unopposed for the top seat and got the 20% minimum number of votes needed to take office, with 6,729 out of the total 25,824 eligible voters. Voter turnout was just over 35%.

In addition to the polling for the presidency, voters also cast ballots for regular council seats, of which 12 were up for grabs in each of the three municipalities.

PHUKET CITY: The latest casualty of teenage gang violence in Phuket was 14-year-old Theeraphong Thongklam, stabbed through the heart early morning November 19 in downtown Phuket City.

Phuket City Police Sub Lt Jakrapong Suchol said that the victim fell off his motorbike near the Montri Rd-Phang Nga Rd intersection at 2:30 am after being stabbed by a member of a gang.

The victim was a resident of Rassada Village 7, Lt Jakrapong said. Theerapong's friend, who was riding pillion

First 'mobile registration van' to launch in Phuket

PHUKET: Thailand's first "mobile registration van" will go into service December 3, when it makes its first stop in Koh Kaew, north of Phuket City.

Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit officially launched the high-tech van on November 8 in Patong, in the car park of the BanThai Beach Resort & Spa, which donated the new diesel Toyota Hiace to the project.

The goal of the project, the first of its kind in Thailand, is to register as many as possible of the estimated 300,000 migrant Thais who now call Phuket home, but who are officially residents of other provinces.

With about half of the Thais living in Phuket registered, Phuket loses out on budget allotments from the central government that are based on population, including critical areas such as education and law enforcement.

The Internet-enabled van is fitted with equipment valued at 4.6 million baht, much of it funded by local administration organizations and corporate donations.

Officials are still negotiating with TOT about the rate for the satellite link that allows the van's

computers to upload information directly to the Interior Ministry database in Bangkok.

However, the TOT will provide the link free for three months from December 3.

Services available from the van include Thai ID cards, change of house registration information, birth and death certificates and change of one's name.

The service may be expanded to include employment law and other legal advice.

Gov Niran, who conceived and initiated the project, hopes to acquire funding for more mobile registration vans in the future.

The project is administered jointly by the Phuket Provincial Administration Office (*OrBor-Jor*) and Phuket's three district offices: Muang, Thalang and Kathu, all of which offer the same services provided by the van.

The *Gazette* will publish the van's itinerary as soon as it becomes available.

Burglar arrested after slashing victim with knife

PHUKET: Police have arrested a burglar who broke into a home near Tesco-Lotus on the night of November 10 and repeatedly slashed its female occupant with a knife before fleeing.

Pol Capt Supachai Petchsakul of Phuket City Police said that the attack happened about 11 pm in a residential area off Songkhla Rd in Tambon Rassada, near the Tesco-Lotus intersection.

The attacker, later identified as Rawai resident Chawinwat Darakai, 23, was arrested by Phuket City Police for the stabbing 35-year-old Phusanisa "Oy" Makmai, who runs a laundry service from her small, one-story flat

occurred when she returned home. "I entered through my front door. As I walked to the rear door of my flat, he came at me suddenly from near the back door with a knife I kept in the house.

"He first tried to slash me in the stom-Pol Capt Supachai Petchsakul of Phuket ach, but the blade didn't penetrate the skin. Then he began slashing my right arm.

"I screamed and he ran towards the back door, but my neighbors were already there. So he ran behind me out the front door and I ran to a nearby noodle stand for help," said K. Oy.

Chawinwat, who was wearing only shorts at the time of the attack, fled barefoot carrying his jeans and the victim's Nokia 3230 mobile. K. Oy discovered her attacker's san-

K. Oy told the *Gazette* that the attack dals outside her bathroom when she returned the following day, she said.

Her neighbors caught the man and held him until police arrived while she was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital for treatment for six knife wounds, she said.

Capt Supachai told the *Gazette* that Chawinwat had confessed that he had entered the woman's home to steal valuables, but he had denied that a woman's bra found in his pocket at the time of his arrest belonged to the victim, as reported by one newspaper.

K. Oy told the *Gazette* that her attacker had been charged at Phuket Provincial Court with assault, theft and drug possession, after marijuana was discovered in his pocket.

Chawinwat is being detained at Phuket Provincial Prison, she added.







Ladyboy, 19, slain in Patong

PATONG: Kathu Police are investigating the grisly murder of a teenage ladyboy whose strangled and beaten body was discovered near the road to Tri Trang Beach on the morning of November 12.

Kathu Police Superintendent Pol Col Grissak Songmoonnark identified the victim as 19year-old Thanawoot Wiriya-

A native of Phatthalung province, K. Thanawoot worked in the Patong nightlife industry, he

"About 11:30 am, we received a report that a body had been found and immediately rushed to the scene, a hilly area about 25 meters upslope from the road that leads to Tri Trang Beach.

"We found the victim lying face down near a concrete wall. She was dressed in blue jean shorts and a blue blouse.

"Her purse, cellphone and other belongings were scattered around her body.

"Evidence suggests that she was killed elsewhere, then hurriedly dragged into the woods and dumped," he said.

An initial examination revealed that K. Thanawoot had been strangled, stabbed in the neck and hit in the head with a blunt object. A doctor at Patong Hospital said that she had died no more than 12 hours before her body was discovered, he said.

An initial examination revealed that K. Thanawoot had undergone complete gender reassignment surgery, Col Grissak

After questioning the victim's friends and stepfather in Phatthalung, police learned that K. Thanawoot had been a very attractive and popular ladyboy.

She had been working in a bar in Patong since early December after moving to Phuket from Phatthalung.

K. Thanawoot was last seen leaving the bar with one of her many lovers, Col Grissak

Police suspect jealousy as the motive for the murder, though they are aware that the victim also had a criminal background, including two arrests on charges related to ya bah (methamphetamine), he said.

K. Thanawoot had been known to scout other ladyboys to work for an Internet pornographer who was arrested earlier this month in a hotel near Soi Bangla, Col Grissak added.

Col Grissak told the Gazette on November 20 that the investigation was ongoing and declined to reveal further details for fear of jeopardizing the case.

Seized Buddha images donated to Thalang museum

MAI KHAO: In a small ceremony at Phuket International Airport, Airport Customs officials November 15 handed over to the Thalang National Museum 93 Buddha images seized from departing tourists over the past year.

Phuket Airport Customs Director Ruthai Lertkietdamrong told the Gazette most of the images were seized from tourists who bought them from shops unaware that they needed permission from the Fine Arts Department to take them out of the country.

While many of the Buddha images were cheap replicas for which such permission could have been easily obtained, one sandstone image of the Buddha's head was an artifact of historical significance, he said.

The image may date back to the Khmer Empire, could be up to 1,000 years old and probably changed hands many times before its seizure at the airport, K. Ruthai said.

Swedish consulate to close

PHUKET CITY: The Swedish Consulate in Phuket will cease operations June 30 next year.

The consulate, which opened in late 2004 to assist Swedish victims of the tsunami disaster, will be one of four Swedish diplomatic missions closing worldwide for financial reasons, acting Consul General Christina Palm told the Gazette.

Swedish victim-identification work finished in June 2006, but the consulate remained open until the new cost-cutting measures to provide citizen-services to the many Swedish nationals visiting the Andaman region, she said.

Many Swedish citizens arriving in Phuket require assistance after losing passports, becoming hospitalized due to illness or accident or getting into legal trouble, she added.

The Swedish Embassy hopes to appoint more Honorary Consuls in Phuket to help Swedes after the consulate closes.

The Honorary Consuls may recruit local staff for assistance, she added.

The Swedish Consulate moved from its temporary location at the Pearl Village Hotel after the tsunami to set up an office in Phuket City, shared with the temporary Norwegian Consulate until its closure on December 1, 2006.

Miss Christina Palm took over from former Consul General Alf Karlsson, while Pearl Group Managing Director Wichit Na-Ranong is currently listed as the only Swedish Honorary Consul in Phuket.

Two tourists die on the same day

KATA: An elderly German tourist on holiday with his wife drowned at Kata Beach late afternoon November 15. On the same day, an Italian tourist died after taking a fall in the bathroom of his hotel.

Chalong Police duty officer Capt Parichat Jaturonpan identified the deceased German as Rudolf Breidach, 67, a guest at the Thavorn Palm Beach Hotel in Karon.

Mr Breidach, his wife and a female friend, also German, went swimming about 5 pm. There were no Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) lifeguards present in the area at the time, Capt Parichat said.

Capt Parichat did not know whether the red warning flags were posted at the time. The stretch of Kata Beach where they chose to swim has claimed many lives through drowning because of the rip currents that form there, he said.

Mr Breidach's body was taken to Patong Hospital by staff from the Tourist Rescue Center, he

The drowning was at least the third at Kata Beach this year alone, following the deaths of two foreign tourists in separate incidents on October

An Italian tourist also died on November 15, succumbing to head injuries sustained after an accidental fall in the bathroom of his hotel.

Pol Maj Vicharn Suwansit of Phuket City Police identified the deceased as Luca Magozzi,

Mr Magozzi was rushed to Patong Hospital after he slipped on the bathroom floor in his hotel room early on November 15. Maj Vicharn declined to name the hotel where the accident took place.

After slipping into a coma, he was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital, where he died the same

The death is considered accidental and there were no signs of foul play, Maj Vicharn said.

Relatives have been notified and the victim's brother claimed the body November 15.



Investigation into destruction of

he destruction of 21 rai of mangrove forest in Baan Kuku, Rassada, incited 60 local villagers to stage a protest at Phuket Provincial Hall on November 5.

The villagers claimed that, in addition to the clearing of mangrove trees and a road being built at the site, canals had been dug to keep seawater off the property

The canals were also killing off mangroves on some 80 rai of adjoining land that they believe is part of an 800-rai protected mangrove forest, clearly marked with a government sign set in

Somai Charoensook, spokesperson for the Kuku villagers, said, "I have lived in the area all my life and nothing had been done with the land for more than 30 years, until recently when an area was cleared and canals and a road built around it, which now prevent the seawater from coming onto the land."

Following the protest, Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit ordered a committee be set up to verify who owns the land and to confirm what buildings rights the land ownership con-

Indeed, this is the second time the governor has ordered construction to stop at the site. "Although construction that started in May was stopped by the governor, they started again and worked day and night until the canals and road were completed in September," K. Somai explained.

'The construction began with just a small truck earlier this year but they have gone beyond the 21 rai boundaries and they have stopped seawater reaching the mangrove forest, which is on protected land," K. Somai added.

he villagers at Baan Kuku live alongside an 800rai protected mangrove forest, a forest they have been caring for by planting seedlings as part of a government mangrove-reforestation project since 2003.

Now some 21 rai of the mangrove forest has been cleared and canals dug around the project site to prevent seawater from flooding the land. The canals also stop seawater from reaching mangroves on about 80 rai behind the project site. Without the sea water, the mangroves are dying.

The villagers staged a protest and now an investigation has been launched into whether the development is legal. However, the investigation has hit a stumbling block: a sign at the project site says one man owns the land, the local Land Office says it belongs to another.

son to be up in arms over the development. They have actively taken part in a provincial project to reforest the area with mangroves since 2003, when they joined the Chalermprakiet Mangrove-Reforestation Project launched by then-Governor Pongpayome Vasaputi.

However, they also have cause for concern. Similar protests against local mangrove forest encroachment in Phuket have cost the lives of environmental activists, including that of Jurin Ratchapol, one of five locals who were killed in separate incidents in 2001 after protesting against the expansion of prawn farms that were encroaching on and polluting protected mangrove forests.

'Only an 'influential person' would have ignored government orders like that," she alleged. "We do not know what they are building, but whatever it is, it is not right. They are destroying the in for generations. We would never dream of cutting down the trees or destroying the environment that has sustained us for many many years."

OWNERSHIP

Central to the issue are documents pertaining to proof of ownership of the land and how it can be used – and currently the issue of who owns the land is as cloudy as the disturbed muddy mangrove

A sign posted at the site states that Pol Capt Thuaythep Viboonsil is the landowner under Chanote No. 35691 and that he has the right to build on the land.

However, according to the Phuket Provincial Land Office, Chanote No. 35691 states the name of the landowner as Anan Anatrakul, not Capt Thuaythep.

The Chanote was issued October 10, 1984, and approved by then-Phuket Governor Manit

on the land title deed. stepped forward claiming to be the owner of the land. In light of this, the investigation committee is moving ahead to confirm whether the land belongs to the

Initial findings from the investigation reported by the committee's secretary, Suphot Chanakit, are that the landowner claims to have documents to prove occupancy rights to 29 rai of land at the site.

However, K. Suphot told the Gazette that the investigation committee was set to survey the area again at 10 am on November 23. "The Forestry Department will then assess whether the land in question actually belongs to the state," he said.



"The findings from this part of the investigation will be announced by the District Chief by the end of November.

"Land Office officials say that there is a valid Chanote for the area, but cannot be sure where the boundaries lie or whether the land is protected mangrove forest. This will have to be determined by the Forestry Department and other relevant offices,' K. Thavicha added.

"We have raised the issue with the Phuket Provincial Office of Natural Resources and Environment, the Forestry Department and the Muang District Office to confirm whether the land belongs to the state," he said.

"If he did not, then the right to occupy or develop the land would have already expired. If this is the case, the land must be returned to the state," he added.

Before the Chanote was issued, 80 rai at the site was registered under a *SorKor 1* document, which confers occupancy rights but can be upgraded to Chanote (freehold) status. Since then, the land ownership has passed through several hands.

When the *Gazette* asked an official at the Phuket Land Office who was registered on the *Sor Kor 1*, the officer replied, "Our obligation is to simply check

whether all the necessary steps in the issuance of the land titles are followed correctly and that the documentation is in order.

"It is not our duty to check and prove that the correct names are on the documents or whether they match up with the names of signs posted on the property."

The officer declined to be named in this report.

However, K. Somai is adamant the ownership of the land is intentionally murky. "We doubt whether the person carrying out the construction really has legal rights to use the land. As the land has remained untouched for at

least 30 years it should be returned to the state, so it should be impossible for the land office to issue a Chanote for that land.

"We suspect some kind of deal has been worked out in private between the Land Office and influential people. We ask that the provincial authorities investigate and make it clear to everyone who holds the land entitlement and what those entitlements are," she said.

"Now we are waiting for the authorities' decision. Construction has stopped for now and the vehicles are not there, but we still do not know who the land owner is and no-one has offered any explanation.

"We suspect that the land titles have been altered because the Forestry Department already stated that the land was state-owned when the Chalermprakiet Reforestation Project was launched in 2003," K. Somai said.

"Even if the developers do own the land, they have been unscrupulous in their development of it. They have removed trees and dug canals to stop seawater coming onto the land, which is starving the mangrove trees of the seawater they need to survive. "We and generations before us have lived off this land and enjoyed its natural abundance for as long as any of us can remember. We are not laying claim to the land. It is for everyone to enjoy. Ultimately it belongs to the government, all Thai people and the nation and should remain that way for many years to come.

"We are kept in the dark about what is happening and who is behind the development. It is important that people know about the destruction of this natural habitat and protected land surrounding it."

"They are not considering the bigger picture their development is having on the rest of the area. How do they expect the mangroves to survive if they do not have water?"

Monk perfoms final death-defying miracle

RANONG: Funerals of esteemed monks are always auspicious occasions for believers, a chance to bid farewell to a spiritual leader and wonder what rewards he will get for his life-long accumulation of merit.

At the funeral of an abbot in Ranong, the deceased clergyman's spiritual power was reportedly so strong that his mortal remains refused to burn

Phrakhru Praphasawiriyakhun, abbot of Wat Wareebaphot in Tambon Bang Norn, passed away on October 17.

When the day of his intended cremation arrived on November 8, the temple was packed with the faithful coming to see off their abbot. The ceremony was presided over by the Governor of Ranong Province, Kanchanapha Keeman.

Leading up to the ceremony, the heavens were overcast and rain poured down all day, threatening to wash out the proceedings. When it came to the hour of the ceremony, however, the rain suddenly stopped and the clouds cleared as if by a miracle.

At 9 pm, the body of Phrakhru Praphasawiriyakhun, or Phra Duan as he was known to his followers, was brought out and laid on the pyre. The flames were lit and began to lick at the monk's body.

After a few minutes, the monk's followers began to realize that something out of the ordinary was taking place before their eyes: Phra Duan's body seemed to be impervious to flames.

After about half an hour on the flaming pyre, there were little more than a few minor scorch marks on his saffron robe. The body was unblemished by the heat.

With the body so steadfastly refusing to burn, the cremation had to be called off. Phra Duan's body was brought down from the fire and placed back in his coffin.

He was then taken to the temple's Hall of the Reclining Buddha, where stunned devotees changed his robes to the sound of cheering from the funeral guests, all amazed that the Phra Duan's holiness had been stronger than the flames. Police and volunteers worked together to prevent guests getting too near the body, fearing that scuffles would break out between people desperate to get pieces of Phr Duan's singed robe to make into charms and amulets.

Witnesses reported that after the 30 minutes on the flaming pyre, the only marks on Phra Duan's body were a couple of small burns on his arms. The lenses in his glasses were uncracked and his robe was only slightly burned.

Phra Duan's followers then lifted his body above their heads and carried him among the guests for all to see.

When everyone had had a chance to catch a glimpse of the body, it was placed back in a coffin while the temple's directors decided what to do it next.

In the end, the directors decided to keep the body in a glass coffin so people could come and pay their respects.

Somphian Banyicheng, a guest at the funeral and a follower of Phra Duan, said that he believed the reason the body's flame retardant qualities came from Phra Duan's holiness as he had been a strict follower of the dharma for many years.

As it became clear that the cleric's corpse was incombustible, K. Somphian shouted for water to extinguish the useless flames.

Phra Duan, a native of Songkhla Province born Duan Prangsuwan, initially wanted to be a policeman. After failing the entrance tests at the age of 21, he became a monk instead.

After spending Buddhist lent in a temple in Phatthalung, he went and practiced meditation in a cave in the province's Khao Chai Son hills for two years.

He then traveled around making merit, eventually ending up staying in Bang Non. As the story goes, one night a hairy, dark-skinned man dressed only in a loincloth appeared to him and asked him to stay in the village.

In 1959, Phra Duan started building Wat Wareebaphot, where he remained doing good deeds until his death.

Stamp to mark the 5th Arts of The Kingdom Exhibition

PHUKET: Thailand Post will launch a stamp December 18 to honor the Fifth Arts of The Kingdom Exhibition, which is being organized by The Foundation of the Promotion of Supplementary Occupations and Related Techniques (SUPPORT foundation) founded by HM Queen Sirikit.

The stamp is being issued to promote cultural heritage and features an image of the *Busabok Mala*, a transportable throne pavilion with

pointed roof. The original *Busabok Mala* is now used as an altar at the Grand Palace.

The image shows the small gable all covered with gold and adorned with nine gems while the spires feature diamond-encrusted flowers. The entire throne sits atop a decorative pedestal.

Measuring 42 by 70 millimeters, the stamp will cost 20 baht, or 90 baht for the stamp affixed to a commemorative-issue envelope. Only 800,000 of the stamps will be produced. The stamp will be available at all 10 post offices in Phuket.

Internet cafés face 'culture crackdown'

nline games that in volve sex and violence are popular among Thai youths, a poll has revealed. Ladda Tangsupachai, head of the Culture Ministry's Cultural Surveillance Department that commissioned the poll, said most youths used the Internet to search for information, play online games and download music or movies.

Online-game-playing respondents ranked their favorite themes as fighting, fantasy worlds, crime shootouts, stripping and seducing young women.

More than half of the youths said they had seen obscene or pornographic materials on the Internet, including downloading porn pictures or clips (64%), playing games on pornographic sites (16%), chatting about sex with others (13%), uploading sexual pictures or messages onto websites (11%), and using webcam services such as Camfrog (6%).

Moreover, 27% of male respondents and 8% of the females surveyed admitted they had sex with people they had met online. Of this group, 28% of males and 59.4% of females said the sex was not consensual.

To combat the problem, the National Committee on Safe and Creative Media is gathering information on Internet cafés and computer-game shops to classify them as red (dangerous) or green (safe). Venues issued stickers would face legal action by the police, she said.

Violence rising. The use of violence in the country has been on the rise with more than 200,000 people being physically attacked last year, up 30% from 2002.

In 2006 alone, 216,037 were rushed to hospitals because they were victims of physical attacks. Of these cases, 3,086 died of their injuries.

The findings came from a report by the Bureau of Epidemiology, which has gathered information from 24 hospitals across the country, he said.

Infantile debate. Deputy Prime Minister Sonthi Boonyaratglin has been criticized for recently saying that pregnant illegal immigrants, mostly Burmese, should be sent back to their home countries to deliver their babies before being allowed back into Thailand.

Assoc Prof Phanthip Kanjanajittra, a Thammasat University law lecturer, said such a practice would backfire and create hatred between Thais and Bur-

"DPM Sonthi apparently misunderstood the law concerning the nationality of children born in Thailand to illegal immigrants.

"Those children in fact do not automatically earn Thai nationality by birth under an exception under Thai law," she said.

The practice of not issuing birth certificates to children born in Thailand to immigrant workers,

whether registered or illegal, is wrong, she said.

Without birth certificates, these children cannot verify their rightful nationality or link to their parents if they return to Burma because they don't have documents proving their status as members of the same family, she said.

The comments by DPM Sonthi, the now-retired soldier who organized the September 2006 military coup, followed a report that around 2,000 children are born to illegal immigrants nationwide every month.

Express education. Under a new drastic change to be put into effect over the next five years, students attending classes in the six-year compulsory level can complete their studies early if they earn all mandatory credits, Edu-

cation Minister Wijit Srisaan said on November 13.

A credit-earning system used at universities will be introduced in primary schools, both government and private.

"The practice will allow smart students to complete their compulsory education before the six-year period," the minister said.

The general educational standard would also be raised under the reform to increase the minimum passing grade point average to 1.50 or 2.00 from the current minimum of 1.00.

The Office of the Education

Council will coordinate the entire reform process by collecting information from technical seminars to be held during the fiveyear process.

Christmas gift? The Cabinet has agreed to make the Monday following the December 23 election an extra public holiday, Deputy Interior Minister Theerawut Butrsriphum said.

At its weekly meeting, the Cabinet agreed December 24 should be declared a public holiday in order to encourage voters to go back to their constituencies to cast ballots, he said.

Many people live and work outside of their constituencies.

The finance minister was assigned to inform the Bank of Thailand of the Cabinet resolution, K. Theerawut said.

Pessimistic opinions. As many as 60% of top Thai businessmen believe the next government will not last more than two years, according to a survey by Thai Chamber of Commerce.

The survey was conducted among about 379 top businessmen who gathered at its 25th annual meeting.

Of the total respondents, 27.5% even believed that the next government would last just one year.

Yajai Chuwicha, head of the TCC's business poll, said that less than 2% expected the new government to enjoy high stability, while just over 31% foresee low stability and almost 50% foresee moderate stability.

The remainder, about 18%, expected it to be a period of uncertainties.

Charity run a sunny success

he new Four Seasons Resort and Spa's benefit run for cancer research in Thailand was held on November 11 with participants bathed in sun instead of drenched by heavy rain.

The run was part of a charity event held annually at Four Seasons Resorts around the

The event was attended by Surat Thani Governor Winai Buapradit, District Chief Officer Adisorn Kamnerdsiri, Koh Samui Mayor Warakorn Rarranarak and Chief of Police Pol Con Ninwong, as well as Dr Manorom, vice president of the Oncological (Cancer) Society of Thailand.

The race had a total of 152 participants and raised over 450,000 baht.

The funds were donated to the Oncological (Cancer) Society of Thailand under the royal patronage of Her Majesty the Queen.

The racers set off with a 7 am start in three categories – a 7k men's and women's run and a 3k children's walk – with the youngest registered participant being only 23 months old.



"It was a tough call being there that early on a Sunday, but it was well worth it. The sun was shining and there was a real sense of community spirit," commented Krystyna Mylonas, a resident who took part in the run.

Winners on the day were K. Jaimatoon, K. Burapha and nineyear-old Boonyawan Naksuwan.

Disease outbreak. Schools were closed across Koh Samui after a possible outbreak of hand, foot and mouth disease.

Several schools on the island reported students showing symptoms of the viral infection, which is most common in young children.

The disease, characterized

by sores in and around the mouth and rashes on the hands and feet, is often confused with the disease found in farm animals. It is highly contagious and therefore a complete decontamination of in-

fected areas must follow in order to prevent an epidemic.

A Bangkok Hospital representative confirmed that several children around the island have displayed symptoms, but further tests must be conducted to reach a definitive verdict.

The disease, which has no specific treatment, is common in tropical areas and is prone to spread during the rainy

Several schools around Thailand and Malaysia have reported outbreaks, but these are the first suspected cases on Koh Samui

Rain disaster. Koh Samui was declared an official disaster zone after days of heavy rain.

The island was at a standstill as roads were closed due to water inundating areas as drains,

lakes and rivers overflowed.

Authorities declared the island a disaster zone after the waters rose to such a level that emergency government aid was necessary.

Transportation from the airport was halted and passengers were left stranded until flights were resumed on November 9.

Schools were closed November 8 after teachers and students were left stranded the night before when trying to get home.

An administrator of one of the schools said, "We were concerned for the welfare of any-

one needing to use the roads. It was impossible for anyone without a fourby-four truck to get through prime areas, so we made a decision for everyone's safety."

Meteorological reports showed that a tropical depression was responsible for the weather system that caused the rain.

As the rain eased, the water was pumped out by the Thai army.

It is normal

for the island to experience heavy rainfall during this time of year, but over-development and destruction of the natural habitat has exacerbated drainage prob-

Two years ago, the island was declared a disaster zone with the army having to come to its rescue after rain caused roads and bridges to collapse and a landslide killed nine people.

mmigration Police arrested a German man in Ranong for smuggling controlled im potence treatments and sexenhancing drugs from Burma on November 17.

Riker Enris, 31, was stopped on Chalermprakiat Rd in Tambon Bangrin by officers from Ranong Immigration Police led by Lt Col Phuwaphat Suwanrong.

After receiving a report from an informant, the officers searched three black plastic bags Mr Enris was carrying and found an assortment of pharmaceuticals, including Viagra and a number of generic copies of the antiimpotence drug.

Mr Enris was also in possession of other sex-related pharmaceuticals for men and women, police said.

Under questioning, Mr Enris admitted that he had bought the drugs in the Burmese port town of Kawthaung and was preparing to take them to Bangkok to sell, as he had many times before.

The German told police he could sell the pills for five times the purchase price and still undercut the normal street price for the drugs in the capital.

Mr Enris has been living in Thailand for eight years without regular employment, police said.

He has been charged with importing pharmaceuticals into the country without permission.

Bad sport. A former candidate for a seat on Nakhon Sri Thammarat's city council was shot outside the sporting goods shop he owned and died in hospital a few hours later.

A relative who rushed 33year-old Surachit Phiromrak to Maharaj Hospital said that K. Surachit was walking into his shop about 10 pm on November 13 when a youth walked up and started talking to him.

The two talked for a couple of minutes before the youth pulled out a gun and shot K. Surachit once in the solar plexus before escaping on a motorcycle.

K. Surachit succumbed to his wounds in the early hours of the following day.

He had once stood for election to Nakhon Sri Thammarat

Capt Kum-ai's body was sent aboard a police aircraft from nearby Songkhla to his home town in the northern province of Uttaradit.

Democrat Party, though police do not believe the killing was politically inspired.

Col Yanaphat Narasing, Superintendent of Nakhon Sri Thammarat Muang District Police Station, said that he believed the victim knew his killer as the two spoke to each other before the shooting.

Police are investigating adultery, debt problems and a dispute in the amulet trade as possible motives for the killing.

Of the three, adultery appears to be the most likely motive, said Col Yanaphat.

Wheel of jealousy. A man found beaten to death in Nakhon Sri Thammarat's Thung Song district have been the victim of his exwife's new husband, police said.

The body of Prasit Atkan, 49, was found lying next to a canal in the district. About four meters from his body police found a bloodied motorcycle wheel, which they believe was used to beat K. Prasit around the head.

A relative of the victim, Rajana Phanrak, 23, said that before his death K. Prasit had gone to visit his child, who lived with his ex-wife Wiyada.

While he was visiting, K. Wiyada's new husband Charoen Chanthaburi returned home. An argument broke out between the two men, with Charoen telling K.

violent and Charoen began to kick K. Prasit until he fell to the floor, K. Rajana alleged.

Charoen then beat K. Prasit round the head with the motorcycle wheel, the police quoted her as saying.

Breaking camp. In a major embarrassment to the military,

Fourth Army Commander Lt Gen Viroj Buacharoon has rescinded his own executive order that removed 384 young ethnic Malay, Muslim men from their homes in the Deep South.

The 384 included young men who were ordered to sign up for a four-month "job-training" project in Army-run camps in the upper South, as well as those who were ordered to stay out of the region for six months.

Gen Viroj had deemed them likely to be involved in insurgency activities and decided to use his authority under the controversial Emergency Law imposed on the region to send them for "job training" or to banish them from their homes.

As there was not enough evidence to charge these individuals, the Army decided to either ban them or sent them to job-training schemes. Buses were scheduled to return the men from Army camps back to their homes.

The move effectively ends the project, which has been strongly criticized by rights groups on legal and humanitarian grounds.

The military reversal follows a court ruling that detaining the men without evidence was illegal.

"This is a really fun photo shoot. I love traveling and meeting new people. The Thai photographers are really nice," she said.







Ingredients

eggs 200g sugar 1tsp vinegar 2tsp corn flour A pinch of salt Vanilla essence

nal touch.

Method

Chef Ronnie has added a bit more class to this classic dish with a hazelnut-praline mousse crown and passion fruit reflections.

Beat the egg whites until they are stiff and gradually add the sugar, vinegar, salt and corn flour. Keep beating until the mixture is very stiff. Pipe the mixture into a tray and bake at 120?C for 30 minutes. Once done, leave the mixture for three hours.

To make the hazelnut-praline mousse, you need 100 grams of praline cream, a leaf of gelatin, 10 ml of whipping cream, an egg yolk, 30 grams of icing sugar, 10 ml of rum and 150 grams of slightly whipped cream.

The praline cream and gelatin mixture is melted in a double pan to stop it burning. Whip the egg yolk with the sugar and add to the praline and gelatin mixture.

Take it off the heat and add the rum. Fold in the slightly whipped cream then put it in the fridge.

For the passion fruit reflections use 100 ml of passion fruit pulp, 25 grams of sugar, 5 ml of passion fruit liqueur and a teaspoon of arrow root flour.

Heat the mixture to reduce the pulp and sugar to half the original amount, then thicken with the arrow root flour and flavor with liqueur.

To serve, place the pavlova on a plate and crown it with a spoonful of praline mousse. Pour a generous amount of passion fruit sauce around and garnish with kiwi fruit and fresh slices of strawberry.

Top it off with a sprig of

Grass-fed beef tenderloin with herbal potato confit and rock lobster salad Serves 1

Ingredients

800g Beef tenderloin, trimmed and tied with string Rock lobsters cooked in a court bouillon.

Method

For the potato confit you obviously need potatoes, plus roughly chopped onions, rosemary, thyme, sage and sweet basil. Add a little olive oil, butter and salt, then bake slowly in the oven.

For the rock lobster sauce I use white wine and brandy with tomato trimmings and tomato

This is all put in a hot pan with *mirepoix* (onions, carrots and celery) and reduced until all the liquid evaporates. Add cold water, bring it to the boil and simmer for 30 minutes until you get a sauce consistency. Now add

some cream and a small amount of grain mustard and season to

To make the vinaigrette that goes with this dish I use 12 whole shiitake mushrooms, 4 spears of asparagus, 4 cobs of baby corn, rubbed thyme leaves, 12 carrot balls with a little salt and freshground black pepper.

These are added to the sauce, which is made from 8 tablespoons of olive oil, 4 tbsp of balsamic vinegar, 1 tbsp of grain mustard and 3 tbsp of beef juice all mixed and heated in a pan.

The beef needs to be seasoned with salt and pepper and seared in a hot pan before it is roasted in the oven. Once done. take it out of the oven and leave

Now the dish is ready to be assembled. Place the beef in the

eld every year at the beginning of December, the Phuket King's Cup Regatta is the biggest and most popular regatta in Asia.

Now in its 21st year, the King's Cup Regatta this year promises to be one of the most memorable in history.

This year, the King's Cup Regatta will mark the 80th birthday of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej.

One sailor who will once again be out for glory is Lt Peera Sagultem, skipper of the Royal Thai Navy 1 yacht and reigning back-to-back champion of the Phuket King's Cup Regatta IRC 2 class.

Lt Peera explains to Pathomporn Kaenkrachang what it's like to be a sailor at heart.

ailing runs deep in the blood of Lt Peera Sagultem, skipper of the Royal Thai Navy 1 yacht and reigning back-to-back champion of the Phuket King's Cup Regatta IRC 2 class.

Born in Sattahip, Chon Buri, to a naval officer, Lt Peera, 32, knows a thing or two about boats and has been sailing since the ripe age of 14 years old.

A sailing course for kids at the Sattahip Naval Base led to more intensive training at the Sattahip Naval Club. He first tested the waters in an Optimist dinghy and further developed his skills in larger two-person din-

Lt Peera continued his training throughout the 1990s in precadet school, then at the Naval Academy, where he competed as part of the academy's racing

Lt Peera's bid for a win in next month's King's Cup will mark his seventh entry in the annual regatta.

He sailed his first foray into regatta racing at the 1995 King's Cup as a crew member of the naval cadet team, who did not finish with a prize.

After another attempt in 2000, Lt Peera returned in 2002 for his first taste of King's Cup

victory – his Royal Thai Navy 2 naval cadet team placed first in the Cruising 2 class.

In 2003, the IRC 2 class was formed, which has since been dominated by Thai Navy sailors. Royal Thai Navy 2, with Lt Peera as a crew member, won the title that first year.

The next year he joined Royal Thai Navy 1, which emerged the champion, and then, at the helm, sailed the boat to victory in both 2005 and 2006.

The key to winning, Lt Peera says, is to aim for perfection every time.

"The challenge in sailing is in making the fewest mistakes. If we cannot [prevent mistakes] that means we are at a disadvantage."

Acknowledging that smooth sailing is rare indeed, Lt Peera says, "Everything can change within a second when you're sailing."

Having a strong, adaptable team is essential, he adds.

Describing his 2006 King's Cup win, Lt Peera says, "One day, the wind was light and a long-distance course was set."

Lt Peera's crew, on board a 34-foot Farr MRX, took an early lead. "We normally covered one of our opponents, but we couldn't do it that day because they disappeared from

view after we rounded the first gate.

Then they sailed off in a different direction, which made us hesitate and wonder if should follow to cover them, or sail a course of our own."

After considering the sailing conditions, Lt Peera decided to forgo any covering, instead choosing to sail close to the islands

"That day, everyone kept an eye on our boat because we were sailing in a zig-zag pattern.

"We sailed right along the edge of the islands all the way to the finish," he says.

"We kept an eye on the current and the wind, and kept to our

best time and became the leader of the IRC 2 class. "In the days following, many other sailors followed the same "shortcut", he adds.

Lt Peera's naval career has taken him to coastal areas all over Thailand, from the Andaman to the Eastern Seaboard and now, fittingly for a man very familiar with the waters surrounding

Phuket, he is Commander of HMTS Phuket.

Returning to the Royal Thai Navy 1 crew this year is Lt Peera's older brother, Lt Cdr Pornpong Sagultem, along with veteran sailors Chief Petty Officer 1st Class Teera Wonglak, Petty Officer 1st Class Chaiwat Taikhing and four new crew

members.

Although he is happy with his crew, Lt Peera says he expects strong competition from teams from Malaysia and Hong Kong

For Lt Peera, helming a racing yacht is about more than the accolades. "Sailing lets me be free," he says.

"Every time I sail I face different winds, currents and situations, but I can take control of the situation and sail to where I want to go."



recent trip to Bali prompted me to take a diversion from my usual subject of animals and environmental issues. Phuket and Bali have a lot in common in that they are both tropical islands dependent on tourism.


Climate-wise, the islands complement one another. In sharp contrast to Phuket, Bali's dry season generally lasts from April until October. Although hotel rates in Bali do not seem to vary there as they do here, there are peak prices charged during the Christmas-New Year period, which is the middle of their rainy season.

It never ceases to amaze me how many tourists visiting Phuket in the rainy season don't come expecting rain; I suspect the same happens in Bali. The temperature in the evenings, even on the coast, felt a few degrees cooler than in Phuket, probably owing to the more constant sea breeze.

Hotel prices vary considerably, but comparing Laguna Sheraton Bali with Laguna Sheraton Phuket shows that in low season, you can get a better deal in Phuket. In high season, however, it's the other way round.

Phuket is about three hours nearer to Europe, whereas Bali is much closer to Australia, its tra-

markets such as Korea, Hong Kong, and mainland China.

Bali has been a major tourist destination much longer than Phuket. You would therefore expect Bali's infrastructure to be more firmly established; this seems to be the case – mostly. English is spoken everywhere

and all signs are in English as well as Bahasa Indonesia, the official language.

Power cuts are rare; drought unheard of. Although far from pristine, there is no visible garbage problem there either. Major roads are good, but in the tourist resorts congestion at peak times can be worse than Patong.

The standard of driving is much the same as in Phuket, although motorcyclists in Bali have got the message that it is a good idea to wear crash helmets. It is interesting to note that lifeguard towers are everywhere, with the warning flags changed regularly something Phuket could learn

Both islands have had their problems. SARS and bird flu had an impact in both places. Two new cases of bird flu were reported in Bali last month. While Phuket was hit by the devastating tsunami in 2004, Bali suffered at the hands of terrorist bombings in 2002 and 2005. The well-publicized case of Schapelle Corby, the Australian girl handed a 20year prison sentence for drug smuggling, also led many Australians to boycott the island.

Phuket is a beach destination with virtually all its attractions water-based. Bali has nothing to compare with Phang Nga bay or the beauty of the many offshore islands there. Diving is undoubtedly superior in Phuket. The only recreational activity where Bali wins is surfing, as it has perfect conditions all year round on its western beaches.

Even the most die hard Phuket supporter would have to agree that inland attractions here are limited. Bali, which is 10 times the size of Phuket, is like an island beach resort combined with many of the types of attractions one might associate with Northern Thailand.

The changes in scenery and climate in Bali are amazing, with volcanic mountains rising to more than 10,000 feet within a few miles of the coast. As you travel inland, the vista changes from rice paddies to coffee and spice plantations, then fruit orchards and vegetable gardens. Finally, you hit the mountains and lakes that transverse the center of the island. The temperature is cool and the views stunning.

For shopping in Bali, there are many boutiques owned by designers from Europe and Brazil who have based themselves on the island. Quality is superb and prices about a tenth of what you would pay in the West.

The Indonesian rupiah can be confusing, with every trip to an ATM making you feel like an instant millionaire. There are currently about 290 rupiahs to one Thai baht. A word of warning: do not take Thai baht with you, because the exchange rate with money-chnagers is abysmal.

Hiring a Toyota Avenza with a driver and separate guide for 10 hours cost just 1,080 baht. Patong tuk-tuk drivers take note! Dinner at a modern Italian restaurant on Seminyak's trendy eatstreet came to under 1,300 baht, including wine. The local food is quite bland and nowhere near as good as Thai food, but international restaurants are every-

The only downside to Bali is the incessant army of hawkers. They are everywhere and simply refuse to take "no" for an answer. Wherever tourists go, even inland, you will find hawk-

Gripes aside, for anybody after a break from Phuket, Bali has plenty to offer.

Even though property in Bali is much cheaper than here, Phuket feels like home. To me, Bali lacks that certain je ne sais quoi.





ave you ever wanted to take a bath in a bowl of tom yum soup? No? Maybe that's my Thai roots showing. I've always thought it would be fun. I'm sure British people dream of brushing their teeth with Marmite and Americans fantasize about sugar showers.

Most foreigners who visit Thailand are rather taken by our famous *tom yum gung*. My husband often asks me to cook up a bowl when he fancies a change from his Western dishes.

Imagine my delight then, when I found out that the same ingredients I use to make my delicious, spicy soup can be used for skin care and detoxification.

The herbs used in the soup act as gentle exfoliators, providing a nourishing effect that brightens the skin and relieves tired, stiff muscles while boosting blood circulation – sounds terrific.

Tom Yum Therapy is the latest brainwave of the inspired therapists at Spa Canvaree at Centara Villas Phuket.

I couldn't wait to go and try it out. My only reservation was that I'd leave the spa smelling like soup. While I wouldn't have a problem with it, I think it might disturb other people – my husband in particular.

Driving from Patong and climbing the hill up to Karon, I arrived at Centara Villas. The resort is tucked away in a rain forest overlooking the sea.

A m o r n r a t Prawing, manager of Spa Canvaree, welcomed me to my Thai-soup fantasy. I was feeling hungry and considered asking if I'd be fed as well as treated with tom yum.

My welcome drink was a fairly normal glass of hot lemongrass, though.

K. Amornrat went through the formalities, telling me that the spa has been open since 2000. It has two open-air, outdoor salas for massage, aromatherapy and various other treatments.

There are four therapists catering to resort guests and walk-in customers.

Although I had my heart set on the Tom Yum Therapy, the other treatments were also

tempting, but none looked good enough to eat.

Reading through the spa menu, I saw that it included body

scrubs, body wraps, facials, manicures and massage.

Prices ranged from 495 baht to 2,295 baht for treatments of between 45 minutes and two hours.

"The Tom Yum Therapy has been wellreceived by guests," said K. Amornrat. It

lasts for two hours and comprises an Exotic Tom Yum Body Glow – you get scrubbed and wrapped

in *tom-yum* ingredients. It's like a human *tom-yum* fajita.

I started my *tom-yum* journey by following therapist Nongluck "Luck" Phunakphan to the changing room where I was given a robe and some disposable underwear.

K. Luck led me to the treatment area and cleaned my feet with a mixture of warm water, milk, galanga, lemon grass and sliced lime. Next up was my *tomyum* scrub.

Laying face down on the treatment bed, K. Luck got to work on my whole body with her tom-yum ingredients. All the while, I could hear the soothing sound of the waves of the Andaman Sea gently lapping against the shore.

The ingredients of the treatment included tamarind water, lime peel, coconut milk, grilled

I closed my eyes and imagined I was an oversized prawn in an enormous *tom-yum* pot. I lost myself in a vivid dream about being cooked in a soup but quickly came around before being eaten.

I felt relaxed, as if all the stress had left my body. The smell of *tom yum* was bliss.

I was then wrapped in plastic film for 20 minutes before K. Luck told me to take a shower.

I washed the ingredients from my body and could feel how soft and tender my skin was. I didn't even have to use body lotion after the treatment.


The coconut milk and grilled


coconut meat had done its job, said K. Luck. After my shower, I laid back down while K. Luck gave me a massage, applying an essential oil called Siamese Bliss.

Even if you aren't a big fan of *tom yum*, this treatment is still worth trying because of the softness of your skin afterwards and relaxed feeling you have when you leave the spa.

The treatment costs 1,495 baht. As my treatment came to an end, I thanked K. Luck and K. Amornrat and said goodbye before rushing to the nearest restaurant and ordering a *tom yum gung* I could actually eat.

Master reflects on the Silk Road

thought I was au courant with the best modern travel writers but there was a huge gap in my knowledge called Colin Thubron.

I happened to read a review of his latest travel book, Shadow of the Silk Road (Chatto & Windus, London, 2006, 363pp) and then a colleague turned up at the office with a copy, full of praise for the book.

"This transcendentally gifted writer is, of course, one of the two or three best living travel writers, in some ways probably the best," reads a back-page blurb by Jan Morris, no slouch of a travel writer

Born in 1939, graduate of Eton College, Thubron has written nine travel books and seven novels, the most recent shortlisted for the Man Booker Prize.

He wrote his first travel book about Damascus when he was 29, followed by a second about Lebanon.

The rest of his travels have been in the great landmass of central Asia where he has learned to speak Russian and Mandarin Chinese.

His latest book follows the 7.000-mile Silk Road from the ancient Chinese capital of Xian to the Mediterranean port of Antioch.

It was a slow journey of seven months, written in a leisurely descriptive style that reflects the scholarship and civility of an earlier era.

For Thurbon this is a return to areas



traveled in two previous books: The Silk Road and Lost Heart of Asia. In Xian, he is shocked by the changes wrought in his 18-year absence.

He remembered a city shattered by the Cultural Revolution, concrete blocks and half-empty stores, a river of bicycles and regulation colors of brown, gray and serge blue. "It seemed a place of inert history, and fatal patience.

"But now it had shattered into life. I recognized almost nothing. It has not frozen in grandeur like Beijing, but transformed into a hectic procession of overcrowded shopping malls, restaurants and high-tech industrial suburbs.

'The nine mile circuit of its walls, which once seemed to enclose nothing, was bursting with reborn vigor, the massive gates funneling in traffic which clogged the boulevards for miles."

He visits the shrine of the legendary

first one, Qin Shi Huangdi, who proclaimed Xian the first capital of a unified China in

Here, the silk caravans set out for the West and here caravans from the West finally reached their destination. Xian was once the greatest city in the world.

Colin Thubron sets off west on a 450-mile train ride to meet up with an old friend in Lanzhou, a poor schoolteacher now risen to university dean.

He travels on to Jiayuguan, "The Gate of Sorrows" or the mouth of China, the end of the Great Wall and the last bastion of civilization before the howling barbarian wilderness.

Yet modern China stretches a thousand miles to the west, inhabited by the Uighurs, a Turkic Muslim people in-

creasingly resentful of the incursions of modern Chinese.

At the oasis of Dunhuang, he visits 4th-century Buddhist grottoes where travelers had asked monks to pray for their souls or offered gifts in thanksgiving for their return.

"Even then the oasis was a lodestar reaches Antioch.

Yellow Emperor and the tomb of the real for merchants. Here the Silk Road forked westward, skirting the terrible Taklamakan desert north and south on fifteen-hundredmiles tracks to the Pamir mountains. Whichever route the merchants took, they converged on Dunhuang to amass supplies, hire guides, buy camels."

Thubron wanders amid the temple murals, noting, "The influences of China,

India, Central Asia, even Persia, jostled and interfused."

Then he is out of China and into the sad. newly independent and impoverished Central Asia Muslim countries of Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan, visiting the old ruins of Samarkand and Bukhara. Often there's not much to see. The Mongols of Genghis Khan prided themselves on plowing under whole cities.

After a rough passage through northern Afghanistan, he's into the more

gentle, urban, modern world of Iran where the many educated women he meets seethe under their chadors.

Moving into Turkey, a country of good roads and tour buses, he luxuriates the hot water of his first decent hotel. You share his weariness and relief as at last he

Let the games begin

For an island where bureaucrats and elected officials at every level harp on incessantly about the need to promote tourism, their collective failure to support the recent King's Cup Rugby-80 tournament comes as an inexplicable irony.

This year's event, which initially drew interest from top rugby sides including current world champions South Africa and former world champions France, ended with just four teams taking part.

Many teams are understood to have lost interest after it became known that the pitch at Karon Stadium was in no condition to host the tournament. Despite a 1.2-million-baht returf of the field in March courtesy of the Rotary Club of Patong, local soccer matches played at the stadium had degraded the pitch to the point where it could not be used for rugby, forcing the event to be moved.

Hardly impressed were the four teams that did end up competing in the event, which was televised nationally by True Visions – another loser in this latest sports tourism fiasco.

It appears that Karon Municipality, the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) and the Ministry of Tourism and Sports have failed to realize the importance of Karon and Surakul Stadiums being able to host international sporting events.

When Surakul Stadium received a 38-million-baht upgrade so that it could host the Fifa U-19 Women's World Championship in 2004, the understanding was that the venue would field many more international events.

That has not been the case, though the facility maintains a busy schedule hosting of worthy local scholastic sports and other not-so-worthy activities, such as "VIP" soccer matches in which local, middle-aged office workers do battle against one another.

Citing the likelihood of damage to the pitch, the *OrBorJor* has repeatedly denied requests to host international rugby events there, even though there is keen interest among event organizers in establishing Phuket as a center of regional rugby play.

The International Rugby 10s, a successful charity event now going into its 10th year that draws hundreds of foreign players and their families to the island, has also been afforded second-class status

Adding to the irony is that fact that sports tourism development is one of the cornerstones of the Governor's provincial development strategy, which includes construction of a 1.4-billion-baht sports complex in Mai Khao.

Given current developments one can only wonder what that facility, if ever completed, might actually be used for: a new weekend market, perhaps?



Sea, sun, sand saga

Thanks for the story on pages 4 and 5 of the November 17 online edition of the *Phuket Gazette*. I have posted the following blog on thaivisa.com as a response to the comments from the Sea Sun Sand manager and the police:

I am one of the people who wrote to the *Phuket Gazette*, which kindly put in the article about our side of the Sea Sun Sand story.

With regards the comments written by the manager of the resort and the Thai police, please note:

- We were not asked to come back to the police station for further questioning, or we would have done so.
- We [the guests] did not all know each other; how can 6 separate rooms of people all be lying?
 - The only reason some of

us stayed in reception informing returning guests to check their safes was because the staff were rude and aggressive, not letting us contact the manager and were making a complete mockery of our predicament.

- With regard to us trying to get a "free vacation", there is no way that we could make a travel insurance claim to even cover the amount of money stolen, let alone try to rort a free holiday out of it.
- My travel insurance would only cover AUS\$250 in cash with a AUS\$100 excess on the claim.

We had AUS\$350 stolen, so we could have claimed AUS\$150, except we would have had to pay AUS\$80 to have the police report translated into English. Our travel insurance wouldn't cover the cost.

• Our friends who had AUS\$500 (15,000 baht) couldn't claim at all as their insurance didn't cover money stolen from a safe.

Kata-Karon police station opens

have a number of unsolved cases that I will soon be delving into. My main con cern is to uphold and protect people's lives and property. Earning the trust of tourists will depend on how efficiently we are able to work from this point on-

Although Kata-Karon is one of the most popular tourist areas, we previously had only one team of two patrol police operating there. I decided this was insufficient.

Chalong Police Station has about 140 officers, so we have assigned 20 officers to a new substation - Karon Police Station that will will operate in the same way as Chalong Police Station. The sub-station opened November 16, just in time for high sea-

Karon Police Station, located near Karon Stadium, has its own chief and there are now extra officers patrolling the beach area. We now patrol from 8 pm until midnight because there have been a lot of robberies in that area. We also have a number of police on motorbikes there.

Officers have been positioned on the roads around Kata, the Kata-Karon viewpoint and the road to Patong. If we have checkpoints on all of these roads we will be able to catch crimi-



fter just a week in his new role as Superintendent of Chalong Police Station, Col Samarn Chainarong announced on November 9 that Chalong Police had arrested two of four people involved in a series of robberies

Col Samarn, 50, was transferred from Kapong District in Phang Nga to Phuket as part of an annual reshuffle ordered by Royal Thai Police Headquarters in Bangkok.

A 1980 graduate of the Royal Police Cadet Academy in Nakhon Pathom, Col Samarn worked for Phuket Provincial Police crime suppression unit before moving to Kapong. He earned his master's degree from Krirk University in Bangkok.

Here he tells how he plans to tackle crime in the south of the island



In the future, I will talk with to my superiors to ask for a report book for the Karon sub-station. Usually, only one report book is allocated per station. That means people in Kata Karon still have to travel to Chalong to file a report. That will change if permission is granted.

Kapong is totally different to Phuket. There are far fewer cases of crime in Kapong. I was there for about three-and-a-half years. I was happy when I was working there, but it's a very small

district.

In Kapong, there are about 50 police officers covering an area of about 580 square kilometers with a population of 12,000 people, while Phuket is 540 square kilometers [with a registered population of more than 300,0001.

lice duty in Phuket because I have done it before and I know the overall picture of the problems here. I now have the power to

Most of the cases in Chalong recently have been robberies. I think these robberies are being conducted by the same gang, because the crimes follow similar patterns.

Even if we arrest some members of the gang, the gang leader will still evade us.

Most foreigners in Chalong are residents here. We want to ask for help from local people if they have any information that might lead to the arrests of the people who have been behind the recent robberies.

I'm glad to be back on pocontrol it and I will try my best.

As for the murder cases, I will have to review the case files. I have been in my position for just a couple of weeks [since November 7] and as soon as I have updates on cases I will let the pub-

I meet daily with the investigation team and various other police teams, but sometimes I cannot reveal all the details about our meetings because I may jeopardize the investigations.

We are trying to deal with the problems in the Chalong area to win back the support of the tourists. We will do our best because Phuket is a tourist area.

Kata-Karon is not so different from Patong. Every police station in Phuket faces a lack of officers. The problems are the same everywhere. Although the number of police increases annually, so does the number of people in Phuket. As a result, I have to ask for help from the local people

Most residents of Kapong were born there, but there are many aliens living here in Phuket so there is a greater likelihood of crime. Tourists may not be on the alert all the time. Sometimes people are desperate and they need to find money for food, so they turn to crime. Criminal behavior is not always an inborn trait; some people turn to crime out of a perceived necessity.

Ten years ago, when I was in Phuket for the first time, most of the cases I had to deal with were robberies.

One of the most serious problems was that the local people were reluctant to help us. Local people can give information to the police without having to tell us their names and phone

We won't reveal their identities to the public. I believe there are people out there who have seen crimes that they haven't

If these people are afraid to come to the police station, they can contact us by calling 191.



Some children, particularly two- to three-year-olds in my experience, also love to try things even though adults have warned them about possible harm.

In this regard, would I be naughty if I asked whether your daughter's emerging personality is more like yours or your wife's?

Generally, however, when children are young we do not feed them spicy food. Exceptions occur, for example, you could have a babysitter and your daughter eats what she eats.

When children start to attend school,

peer pressure enters the picture and that for their ideas. usually means starting to eat spicy stuff.

Nearly all questions helped me to better understand and know more about my own culture and beliefs. I've really enjoyed writing the column.


However, the time has come to say goodbye. I want to thank my readers for their support, especially those who sent in questions and gave comments about my responses.

henever I compare Phuket's Internet capabilities with those of nearby regions and countries, I invariably hear the ultimate defensive reaction, frequently delivered with a slight snarl: "Woody, if it's so good in Hong Kong (or Singapore or Seoul or Samarkand), why don't you just move there?"

The people who ask me that question miss the point.

I live in Phuket because I love it here. I would figure out a way to live here even if I had to transmit gigabyte files over two tin cans with a string tied between them. Many people don't have my unbridled enthusiasm (or, I suppose, high tolerance for pain).

When most individuals or companies look for a place to do business, fast and reliable Internet rates is a prerequisite, not a luxury. The people of Phuket deserve better.

Welcome to my second "open letter" to Thailand's National Legislative Assembly, addressing Phuket's current pursuit of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) City status.

In this article, I want to take a more detailed look at how Phuket stacks up against its nearby rivals for the hearts and minds (and pocketbooks) of computer people all over the world.


CNET News.com's editor, Michael Kanellos, in a recent article on CNET News (www. cnet.com/4520-13653 1-6794290-1.html), neatly summarized the competition facing Phuket's ICT City aspirations with one simple observation: "If you had to pick a continent where most of the innovation in the 21st century will take place, Asia wins hands down."

It's a dog-eat-dog world out there. Let's see how Phuket stacks up.

Kuala Lumpur

Kuala Lumpur's "Multimedia Super Corridor", while still far

from pervasive, shows the government of Malaysia is interested in attracting ICT business.

Take a look at www. msc.com.my and you'll see what I mean. The MSC Bill of Guarantees starts out with a commitment to "(1) Provide a worldclass physical and information infrastructure. (2) Allow unrestricted employment of local and foreign knowledge workers. (3) Ensure freedom of ownership by exempting companies with MSC Malaysia Status from local ownership requirements..."

Telekom Malaysia has a near-monopoly on broadband in Malaysia because it controls the "last mile" between the switch and homes/offices. While most of the people and businesses in Kuala Lumpur get by with an inexpensive 2 Mbps line, TMNet offers 4 Mbps service to most

parts of KL at about 2,500 baht per month. The 1,900-or-so businesses plugged into the MSC backbone get much faster speeds.

India

Bangalore is a successful ICT center but a lousy place to live. Big companies are leaving in droves. Microsoft's biggest campus outside the US is in Hyderabad, an hour-and-a-half's flight away from Bangalore. IBM and other major ICT players are flocking to Pune, near Mumbai.

Bharat Sanchar Nigam Ltd (BSNL) offers 2 Mbps service to 197 cities in India and 8 Mbps to the major metro areas. The quality varies, and the 2 Mbps line at 2,200 baht per month is capped at 20 GB per month.

India's main attraction to the international ICT community remains its large pool of highly educated, inexpensive Englishspeaking engineers. But its Internet capabilities and prices barely bring India out of thirdworld status. Big companies find over the Internet with video on other ways to get fast Internet.

Singapore

Singapore takes broadband seriously; just about everybody in Singapore who wants a fast Internet connection can get one.

SingTel and StarHub dominate broadband service in Singapore. SingTel currently offers 10 Mbps service for 1,500 baht per month. StarHub offers 100 Mbps for 2,700 baht per month.

The government of Singapore, through its Wireless@SG initiative, provides free Wi-Fi access in most commercial areas. Once you're registered, basic wireless (Internet access at 512 Kbps) is free..

Seoul

Wired magazine called Seoul "The Bandwidth Capital of the April of this year,

Seoul hit 100% broadband penetration: 100% of all homes and businesses in

connected to broadband.

The South Korean Internet backbone rivals the US and Europe in speed and capacity. Corporations such as Samsung and LG surely benefit greatly from pervasive fast Internet access.

Hanaro Telecom, Seoul's second-largest broadband provider, has just announced the latest HanaFOS Dream package, which offers 100 Mbps service for 1,400 baht per month.

Earlier this year, Seoul rolled out WiBro, a pioneering 3 Mbps wireless technology that works even in the subway, in buses and on trains. The country is developing incredible technologies, including ipTV – television demand.

Hong Kong

Surfing to a Hong Kong-based website is a painful experience for this Phuket-bound boy. The pages tend to be packed with streaming video that renders at a snail's pace here in Phuket.

On September 20, Hong Kong Broadband Network Limited announced, "We dropped our 10 Mbps service as of today it's just not fast enough." The slowest line you can get from HKBN runs 25 Mbps.

Most people (and businesses) opt for the 100 Mbps line at 1,500 baht per month. Some for the 1 Gbps service h (that's 1,024 Mbps, more than 500 times faster than Phuket's fastest commonly-available line) for 6,800 baht per month.

he credit crunch is being felt in the UK. Lending standards of financial institutions have risen substantially. Bob Michaelson, deputy chairman of UK fundmanagement group Fleming Family & Partners, reported that 50% of new credit card applications are being declined compared with 5% earlier in the year.

British banks and building societies have dramatically reined in mortgage lending. Previously, self-employed people in the UK were able to borrow funds for mortgages without having to produce proof of income. Lenders accepted their word on income statements, merely assuming that

they were hiding much of their earnings from the grasping clutches of the Inland Revenue.

This has now changed – no proof of income, no loan. Even salary earners are finding it more difficult to obtain mortgage finance.

The effect of this is already making its mark in British residential prop-

erty prices. Halifax Bank of Scotland (HBOS), a major UK banking group, reported from national surveys that prices for UK residential properties fell in September and October.

UK homeowners, in an identical manner to their US counterparts, used equity in their houses to increase mortgages. Rising house prices had given them a feeling of affluence. Unfortunately, in most cases, the money was spent on overseas holidays, cars or consumer items.

Many people were using long-term mortgage borrowings to finance relatively short-term goods or services. In other words, mortgages had become ATMs.

The UK residential market is seeing a dramatic rise in repossessions as interest rates have risen and the cost of borrowing has steadily increased. Over 90% of UK mortgages are of the adjustable-rate variety as opposed to Continental Europe where most mortgages are fixed rate.

UK lenders snap their purses shut

A substantial number of new UK mortgages employ a mixed-lending approach, where, for example, a loan is granted at a fixed rate for the first three years before switching to an adjustable rate. Borrowers are facing significantly higher borrowing costs

and many mortgages are due to "reset" over the next 12-18 months.

It is not only homeowners who are feeling the pinch – everyone who has relied on credit is finding that the costs of borrowing are rising and credit is often unobtainable. Credit crunches are events that spread

through many parts of an economy with unexpected consequences.

One of the best tax havens in the world for the foreign rich has been the UK. Tax laws in the UK previously allowed foreigners to be taxed only on UK-sourced income for the first 17 years of residence. Income and capital gains were exempt if they accrued overseas.

The British government now appears to be changing its strategy and wants to tax wealthy foreigners domiciled in the UK for overseas income and capital gains

This might appear a good idea, but most rich foreigners will simply use offshore structures, such as trusts and companies, to escape these taxes, or else they will leave the UK. The word "escape" can be replaced with a relatively new word in the English language: "avoision". This is a mixture of tax avoidance (legal) and tax evasion (illegal), although

some governments employ "anti-avoision" measures.

British consumers have racked up record levels of debt – well over UK£1 trillion (70 trillion baht). There are signs that the UK economy is slowing, which will force the Bank of England to reduce interest rates.

On the television business channel CNBC, one analyst commented that by not lowering interest rates at the Bank of England interest rate meeting in November, the Bank of England will have to play catch-up in the coming months. Many believe that the Bank of England is "behind the curve", which means that its interest rate policy is not in line with current economic conditions.

Before the interest rate decision, Bloomberg television noted that the Bank of England would not lower interest rates as the Governor of the Bank of England was still smarting from the unforeseen Northern Rock crisis.

Also announced was that the UK had experienced the largest trade deficit in history.

David Bloom, chief global strategist for banking group HSBC, acting as a guest host on CNBC's *Europe Today*, said that nobody in America is worried about the weak US dollar and that US exports are "sizzling". For anyone interested in financial markets, David Bloom is always interesting.

The US Administration seems to have forgotten that it favors a strong dollar policy. When pushed, officials will say they favor a strong dollar but will quickly add that the dollar will follow "market forces".

David Bloom is correct in that the weak US dollar is passing unnoticed in the US. Bill Gross of PIMCO and Warren Buffet are both noted dollar bears (people who are negative on the outlook of any financial investment; in this case, the dollar).

Interestingly, Alan Greenspan, former chairman of the US Federal Reserve, was quoted on Bloomberg as saying that he believed the dollar's fall against the euro was at an end. The dollar was, at that point, quoted at \$1.45/€1.

Two days later, it fell in value to \$1.47/€1. Also interesting is that Greenspan is now, among his other activities, a consultant for PIMCO.

The greatest problem for currency markets is not the dollar trend but the speed in which it is falling. It is important for observers to remember that markets almost always overreact. The participants in currency markets can at any stage be caught out by sudden sharp reversals in trends.

The dollar will likely overshoot on the downside when it finally reaches its lowest point, but nobody knows how long this will take and where the bottom will be. In 2002, the euro fell to US\$0.82. In reality, nothing has changed that much.



Floating the fundamentals

nderneath the distinct roofs of upturned boats of the villas at The Village, Coconut Island, known locally as Koh Maphrao, lie modern open-plan designs with a concept of back-to-basics comfort and built-in features for self-sustaining, trouble-free maintenance.

The rounded roofs and Thai-style structures are designed to capture the essence of the waterfront lifestyle of generations past.

All 132 of the villas are on the waterfront or have direct access to the beach, locally known as Laem Hin. The Village is the first development on Koh Maphrao, the realized dream of project owner and Managing Director of East West Development, Chris Gordon, and architect-consultant Suchja Pinyochon. Together they aspired to create beautifully practical homes that blend with their surroundings.

"The 'upturned-boat' roofs are designed to reflect fishing boats in the area and give a smooth contour that fits in with the gentle tropical surroundings," said K. Suchja.

"The roofs are actually made from synthetic lightweight materials with a natural color. We decided on this because it provides better waterproofing than tiles and they were easier to transport to the island."

"The open-plan designs of the living area, dining area and pantry are stylish and practical. They look and feel luxurious, fit in with the surroundings and keep the villa cool without the need for constant air conditioning," he added.

The downstairs ceilings are standard heights, but the upper

floors with dark *maka* beams and floors against plain white walls are an airy six meters high.

"We used *maka* wood for the upper floors, which is actually more expensive than teak these days because of its rarity, as it is harder than teak and long lasting. I think the color of *maka* also offers a very warm, cozy feeling to the home," said Mr Gordon.

Designing the villas took about four months and the master plans another six as K. Suchja and Mr Gordon refined the designs to ensure the homes would not only look good but would be long lasting, safe and practical.

"The roofs conceal a gutter system that collects most of the runoff water for the villa's own cleaning system, which recycles the water for air conditioning and provides hot water for the bathroom," explained Mr Gordon.

"The gutters are made from stainless steel and plastic to en-

sure no rust mixes with the runoff water," he added.

"The wood floors and terraces give the villas a tropical feel. The red *takien tong* wood is traditionally used for building boats and works well with the theme, so we used that for the supporting beams of the balconies," K. Suchja explained.

"We used teak for other outdoor features, such as door frames and window panels. We did consider using pine for the outdoor features but used teak to maintain a tropical mood rather than looking too European," he added.

"The concept was constantly evolving and we would sometimes scrap ideas entirely for new ones resulting from the collaboration of our ideas and experience of what would or wouldn't work," said Mr Gordon.

"I think we have quite a unique relationship that ultimately works very well," he added.

Dalaaburi phase one nears completion

KOH KAEW: Phase one of the is very popular in Phuket at the 522-million-baht Dalaaburi project, being developed by Shinawatra Home Co Ltd, is nearing completion and work on phase two is set to get underway next month.

Of the 29 units in the 13-rai project, 18 will be villas and 11 shophouses. Each shophouse is on the market for 11.5 million baht, while the villas are available for between 21 million baht and 26 million baht.

The first phase of construction, which began September last year, comprises five villas and the 11 shophouses. Phase two will see the addition of seven villas, with six more villas to be completed later in phase three.

"We should be able to finish the whole project by the end of next year," said Chayika "Sand" Wongnapachant, marketing and sales director of Shinawatra Home.

K. Sand told the Gazette that the project is aimed at families and businessmen looking for exclusive, luxury homes in town. Each of the villas are two stories and on 360 square meters of land.

"We chose to fuse contemporary Balinese style with Thai design because the Balinese style restaurants, showrooms and so

moment, but we wanted to do something that was a little against the trend.

"We used a variety of modern designs to make our villas unique. The outside and inside of each villa contrast in styles, although everything is fused together. I think Phuket does not have many properties like this,"

K. Sand explained that the predominant color used in the villas is white because it creates the impression of a new home, no matter how old the residence is. "The interior design is very Thai. For foreigners who have lived in Thailand, they will love this style," she added.

Each of the 11 shophouses is on 294 square meters of land and feature three stories, with two bedrooms and four bathrooms. "The first floor is dedicated to a business area, with a living area-cum-work area on the second floor. The bedrooms are on the third floor," said K. Sand.

"The shophouses can be adapted to accommodate any business. The size of the shophouses – six meters wide – means that they can be used for

on. One customer bought a shophouse to use as a kitchen showroom and another bought a shophouse for an interior-decoration business," she said.

One of the strong points of the development, said K. Sand, is its location in Koh Kaew. The project is close to international schools, shopping centers and hospitals, and the shophouses will benefit from being close to a main road, K. Sand added.

Also provided will be a

children's playground and park, a garden, 24-hour security with CCTV cameras, a clubhouse comprising a library, business lounge, concierge and daycare center.

The villas, each with a swimming pool, will each comprise four bathrooms and three upstairs bedrooms, one of which could be converted into a study. There is space to the side of the kitchen for a maid's room.

The walkway from the gate www.shinhome.co.th

to the front door of each villa has been designed with cement over running water, following the advice of a feng-shui expert. The largest area of each villa will be the kitchen, which is connected to the dining room.

A large, wooden door can be closed to divide the kitchen from the living area and there is parking space for two cars.


"The villas are exclusive homes. There is a security gateway dividing the villas from the shophouses. These homes present urban living in a resortlike environment," said K. Sand.

"When we came up with this project, we designed everything as if we were making the homes for ourselves. We thought about what would make us comfortable if we were to live here," she added.


these people who were important in his life, seeing the names of so many familiar people on the wreaths and flowers.

This isn't without just cause.



The gardenia smells so good you could eat it – well,Bloomin' Bert would...

As my ever-expanding midriff will confirm, I have rather a healthy appetite. Although I can perhaps blame the Thai Asia Pacific Brewery Company – and more recently, a brewer of a rather fine drop from our neighbors to the north – for at least a few of the pounds, it probably simply boils down to the fact that I'm rather partial to fine victuals; good food, in somewhat generous quantities. I've been looking for an excuse that works for some time.

Ice cream is a big part of the problem – I rather like the stuff, but it's not exactly known for its ability to shrink midriffs. The smell of ice cream is what brings us to the gardening section of this week's inanities – the gardenia.

The gardenia, or *pud sorn* in Thai, is one of those plants that smells so good that you almost want to eat it. The blooms produce an incredible scent very much like vanilla ice cream. The smell that's produced when the ice cream is so cold that it becomes crusty. This doesn't seem to happen very often in Thailand – I can't imagine why.

Anyway, the aroma of the gardenia is fabulous. Stick a few of these in your garden, and you'll be raiding the freezer every five minutes, shoveling down ice cream by the bucketload.

The amazing smell oozing from the blooms does come at a price though – it's a bit on the moody side. I had almost given up on a gardenia bush that's in my front garden. For months it just sat there moping, refusing steadfastly to flower, but with the appearance of some serious rainfall, it went mental.

Flowers suddenly appeared all over it and the leaves became variegated (two different colors on one leaf) again. It also became bushier and seemed a lot more content with its lot. If it were human, it would have had a Cheshire-cat grin on its face.

The gardenia grows up to four feet tall and has shiny, deep-green or green-and-white variegated leaves.

Gardenias are a member of the family Rubiaceae and there are more than a couple of hundred species of gardenias.

Gardenias are such a fussy bunch. They like to be given plenty of water and they prefer being planted where they get full sun in the morning and some shade in the afternoon. Plant them in the ground with the crown (where the stem rises out of the ground) slightly above the soil. This will help to prevent root-rot.

Gardenias don't like their roots to be disturbed too much, so once they're in the ground leave the ground around the plant well alone, as the roots are fairly shallow. You wouldn't want them to go off on a hormonal teenager-style reaction. If they're upset, the flowers turn brown, but once they are established in a place they like and given proper care, gardenias will bloom away, providing an abundance of fragrant flowers.

Gardenias can be pruned as much as you like, but there are a few rules to bear in mind in order to keep on its good side. First, cut plants back when they are dormant, which would be the hot, dry season here in Phuket. This allows the stems to "heal" when the plants aren't actively growing. This way you can still enjoy flowers the next year.

When pruning, don't cut all the leaves off. Some leaves need to be left so the plant can produce food for the root system. If you only want your plant to become bushier, just pinch out the tips while the plant is dormant. Pinching will usually promote a heavier bloom the following year.

One other tip: make sure you have a beer in hand when performing the above tasks. It's about the best way I can think of to stave off the urge to dash off to the fridge for more ice cream. Well, it usually works for me. Whoops, there's another half-kilo...
