Airport limousine service shakeup

TAH CHAT CHAI: Phuket Mai Khao Co Ltd has won a concession to operate a new taxi and passenger van service at Phuket International Airport (PIA).

The company will operate 60 vans and 20 cars under a three-year concession won with a bid of 33 million baht, Phuket Airport Director Sq Ldr Pornchai Eua-aree told the *Gazette*.

The company can begin service as soon as the contract is signed, he said.

Somboon Jampathong, managing director and owner of Phuket Mai Khao, told the *Gazette*, "We actually don't have all the cars yet and we intend to ask private taxis and private vans to join us, but if we can't get enough vehicles, we will buy more cars," he said.

"We are waiting for the letter with the contract from AOT [Airports of Thailand]. As soon as we sign the contract we will begin work. We have another company called Airport Car Rental," he added.

The *Gazette* has yet to confirm the fares the new company will charge.

The new service follows the number of vehicles operating at the airport by the Phuket Limousine and Business Services Cooperative (PBC) being slashed by AOT, which grants the concessions.

The PBC currently operates 110 cars and 40 vans at the airport under a verbal agreement with AOT after its concession expired. The total number of vehicles the PBC will be allowed to operate when the new service begins will be reduced to 90, Sq Ldr Pornchai said.

AOT had earlier cited complaints against the PBC's quality of service as one of its reasons for reducing the number of PBC vehicles at the airport.

"I informed the governor that we would like to give passengers more options. Bidding on the new concession was open to all parties capable of meeting our terms and providing a quality service. This included the PBC, but they chose not to bid," he said.

"We will continue to support the PBC because their members are local people. The province asked us why we had to limit their number of vehicles to 90; we explained that this was the number of legally-registered vehicles they have," he said.

Sq Ldr Pornchai did not rule out the possibility that the number could be increased in the future, but said the decision would depend on the ability of PBC drivers to properly register their vehicles and would also be subject to final approval by the AOT.

The AOT board had recently instructed him to "look after" local people and not only cater to the needs of large investors, he said.

The new concession makes Phuket Mai Khao the fourth public transport option at PIA, alongside those offered by the PBC, Phuket Taxi Meter Co Ltd and the Airport Bus service.

"The current transport services are sufficient to meet demand most of the year, though we sometimes face shortages at peak periods during the high season.

"We also have to consider the total number of vehicles we should allow in Phuket. Roads here are becoming very congested," he said.

In a related development, AOT chairman Gen Saprang

Gangs war with 'swords' at Saphan Hin

SAPHAN HIN: Two gangs, each of about 40 teenagers, battled with long-bladed weapons, reported as swords, at Saphan Hin about 1 am on December 2.

In the melee, a 16-year-old died after being struck down while riding his motorbike and a member of his gang fled his attackers by jumping into Klong Bangyai, but with his right hand severed and his right ear nearly cut off.

Phuket City Police Investigator Lt Somchai Nuboon identified the dead youngster as Witthawat Pongsakote, 16.

He was on a motorcycle trying to escape a rival gang when he was attacked and fell off his motorbike near Pramahachanok Bridge, across the road from Phuket Vocational College.

Critically wounded to the head, back and arms, he was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital, where he died of blood loss.

A member of the same gang, Somboon Namkaew, 28, was also set upon.

He managed to escape his attackers by jumping into Klong Bangyai, from which he was later lifted with great difficulty by Kusoldham Foundation rescue workers

Somboon's right hand was severed and his right ear was almost completely cut off. He was being treated at Vachira Phuket Hospital, where he was listed as "out of danger" by staff, Lt Somchai said.

"We already questioned Somboon's fellow gang members and we know the identity of his attackers, who are members of an enemy gang," he added.

New airport limo concession allowed

November 30 to discuss expansion plans to keep up with increasing passenger traffic. He ordered that long-term development plans for infrastructure and management be drawn up.

AOT spokesperson Dr Jermsak Pinthong said that PIA management had been encouraged to "think big" when drawing up the plans and to include whether existing runways need to be lengthened or new ones installed, he said.

Describing the need for a new terminal as "pressing", Dr Jermsak said that AOT had suggested a new seaside terminal and the possibility of separating domestic and international traffic. "We have been informed that passengers face crowding, so we have suggested that the [PIA] management come up with a plan to add new facilities, the work to be carried out in several phases,' he said.

"There are many possibilities, such as building a new terminal by the sea and developing it jointly with a seaport, but that is just an idea at this point," he

PIA was not given any deadlines, but it was understood they were keen to move forward, he said.

On the issue of public transport, Dr Jermsak said it was a local issue to be dealt with by the PIA management team, not the AOT board.

Cop shoots himself by accident

WICHIT: A police officer on a solo stakeout on December 2 accidentally shot himself in the wrist, the Gazette has learned.

Following up a report that an officer had been shot while trying to apprehend a gang of teenage motorcycle thieves, the Gazette spoke to Sgt Rakchart Suksrinuan of the Phuket City Police.

Speaking from a hospital bed at Vachira Phuket Hospital in Phuket City, where he was being treated, Sgt Rakchart denied that he was shot by teenagers suspected of stealing a motorbike in Hok Huad, in tambon Wichit – as reported in the Thai press earlier in the week.

"I accidentally shot myself. I had a report of a missing motorbike in the area, so I went to investigate.

"I found the motorcycle, then hid behind some trees for a few hours waiting for the thieves to return.

When three teenagers approached the stolen bike, I was positive they were the thieves, so I identified myself as a police of-

"They ran off, so I gave chase and

pulled out my pistol with my right hand... then I tripped.

'As I put my hands out in front of me to break my fall, the gun fired and the bullet hit my left wrist," he said.

The force of the bullet shattered his left wrist, but he is still able to move the fingers on that hand.

"I was not able to get a clear view of the teenagers because it was dark and everything happened so quickly," said Sgt Rakchart.

"However, the motorbike has been returned to its rightful owner," he added.

Public ICT facility opens in city center

SAPHAN HIN: As part of a government initiative to promote information and communications technology (ICT) in Thailand, Phuket Municipality and the Software Industry Promotion Agency (SIPA) have teamed up to open the Phuket ICT Skill Development and Learning Center at the Phuket Municipality Youth Center in Saphan Hin.

The ICT Center, officially opened at the auspicious time 11:09 am on December 5, comprises four zones.

The 50-square-meter library zone provides access to books, magazines and other reading materials, in both Thai and En-

The training zone features one section with 20 computers installed with animation software and a general training area with a focus on language skills.

The net zone comprises 30 computers, all with high-speed Internet access.

The 300sqm activity zone features a seminar room where functions and activities for up to 200 persons can be held.

There is also a coffee corner that serves as a meeting point.

Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwannasuppana said that 10 million baht from SIPA and 15 million baht from the Municipality was spent on the 900-squaremeter facility.

House blaze causes B.5m in damage

KOH KAEW: A house near Muslim Wittaya Phuket School in Koh Kaew caught fire early in the evening of December 9, causing damages estimated at 500,000 baht. No injuries were reported.

Phuket City Police Duty Officer Pol Lt Somchai Noobun described the gutted dwelling as a one-story property in a small soi near the school.

He identified the homeowner as Amarin Phinyo, 29, who works transporting wood for Siam Koh Kaew Wood Trade company.

The fire started in the kitchen of the house at about 5 pm, while K. Amarin was asleep. He woke up when a cooking gas canister exploded, said Lt Som-

Called to the scene by a neighbor, firemen arrived and cut the electric power supply to the house before extinguishing the blaze in about 10 minutes, he added

"About 70% of the house was destroyed, causing damage worth around 500,000 baht. We think the fire was caused by a faulty circuit," he said.

Phuket City Police are awaiting a report from Phuket Forensic Police to confirm the cause of the blaze.

PPP 'sweethearts' under fire for biased exposure

PHUKET: A lawyer representing the two Democrat Party candidates running in the December 23 general election has filed a complaint with the Phuket Election Commission (PEC) against local Thai-language newspaper *Siang Tai* and several opposition candidates.

Alleging violations of the 2007 Election Act, the lawyer asked the PEC to ban three candidates from political activities for a year for breaking election law.

The complaint is now being reviewed by the Election Commission (EC) in Bangkok.

Narongrit Nethikiettiwong, a lawyer with NPK International Law Office, filed the complaint on behalf of Tossaporn Thepabutr and Rewat Areerob.

The complaint listed allegations against *Siang Tai*, editor Chaovapong Mekarakkul, the advertising manager and three columnists writing under the names Karawek (a kind of bird), Yiew Plaifa (hawk high in the sky) and Thep Tewin (Angel Tewin).

Also listed on the complaint were Palang Prachachon Party (PPP) candidates Dr Sriyada Shinawatra and Wisut Santikul along with Chart Thai Party candidate Sgt Sorranun Sane.

At the heart of the allegations were news articles that the Democrat candidates claimed supported the PPP candidates but defamed the Democrats, the lawyer said.

Over the past two months, *Siang Tai* has had pictures of the PPP candidates on its front page, including one with the caption "Phuket's sweetheart candidates"

and images of ticked ballot boxes in favor of the candidates.

The lawyer also claimed that the newspaper had published libelous stories about the two Democrat candidates.

He also asked that the PEC suspend the three candidates listed for standing by idly and reaping the benefits of the one-sided coverage when they knew it contravened election law.

The Democrat candidates would wait for the EC's reply before filing a complaint with police, he said.

Also on December 7, a lawyer representing Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) President Anchalee Vanich-Thepabutra filed a complaint with Phuket City Police alleging libel against the same nine parties listed in the complaint filed with the PEC.

K. Anchalee, wife of K. Tossaporn, has alleged that the parties had libeled her by claiming that she had used her position as *OrBorJor* President to help

campaign for her husband.

On December 3, candidates from four political parties filed their own charges with the PEC claiming unfair support by the *OrBorJor* for the Democrat Party candidates.

They presented as evidence a *Siang Tai* article alleging that the *OrBorJor*, using taxpayers' money, to fly members of a housewives association on a four-day excursion to Malaysia as a way of drumming up support for the Democrats.

PPP Candidate K. Wisut told the *Gazette* that he and fellow candidates had asked only for fairness from the PEC after the *OrBorJor* had listed the two Democrat candidates as senior *OrBorJor* advisors on numerous occasion, giving them an unfair advantage in violation of election law.

"The best thing we can do is explain to K. Anchalee that we need fairness from the PEC. We don't want to defame anyone," he said.

Samaritan knifed in worker-camp feud

KAMALA: Five men were hospitalized after a bloody fight following an accusation of attempted rape at a construction site workers' camp on December 10.

Pol Sub Lt Charnsarawut Saeng-aroon of Kamala Police Station reported that the fight, involving an ax and a 12-inch blade, broke out between two pairs of brothers after the wife of a construction worker alleged that another worker had attempted to rape her.

Brothers Cherngchao, 24, and Damnern Suksamranand, 22, and brothers Suthat and Suwat Janmeedee, 28 and 26, work together at a construction camp in Kamala, said Lt Charnsarawut.

About 7 pm that night, Suthat allegedly made an unwanted passionate advance towards Nong Jaeng, the wife of Cherngchao. Nong Jaeng ran screaming from Suthat, claiming that he had attempted to rape her, he added. Cherngchao and Damnern then arrived at the camp and the two pairs of brothers faced off and began fighting. Cherngchao and Damnern were armed with an ax, while the Janmeedee brothers had a knife about one-foot long, Lt Charnsarawut said.

Songwut Phanet, 25, a mutual friend of the group, tried to break up the fight. He received a knife blow to the head for his troubles. He is being treated at Patong Hospital, where he is in serious condition, he said.

During the fight, Cherngchao lost a finger on his left hand, Damnern sustained wounds to his head and torso, Suthat was wounded by ax blows to his head and torso. Suwat received a number of gashes on his hands courtesy of the Suksamran brothers' ax," he added.

"All of the men are in Patong Hospital, hence so far I have been unable to investigate this case," said Lt Charnsarawut.

Brit killed in horror smash

CHERNG TALAY: British national John Alfred, 53, was killed when the Honda Dream motorbike he was riding was hit by a six-wheeled truck about 3:30 pm on December 6.

Cherng Talay Police Duty Officer Capt Amnuaywit Makunthod said that the truck driver fled the scene, near the Tha Yang Bridge on Pasak Rd, but the owner of the truck later reported himself to the police station. "Initial investigations indicate that the victim was trying to overtake the truck when the accident occurred, but more witnesses need to be questioned," he said.

The body of the victim, who had a valid Thai driver's license, was sent to Thalang Hospital, where it was later claimed by his adopted son, a Thai.

The British Embassy has already been notified, Capt Amnuaywit said.









Restrictions slapped on

ecent changes in the national-park policies clearly demonstrate the juggling act the Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation (DNP) is forced to play when trying to balance the need for conservation inside the parks with the need to use the parks as premier attractions to drive Thailand's allimportant tourism economy.

The new pricing structure is intended to draw more foreign visitors to some of the less popular parks, such as Koh Phetra Marine National Park on the border of Satun and Trang, and away from top-draw destinations like Koh Similan and Koh Surin Marine National Park in Phang Nga.

In announcing the measures restricting the number of tourist allowed to enter the 10 national parks, DNP deputy Director-General Preeecha Chansirinanont said the restrictions were put in place to better manage national resources as well as for the safety of tourists.

The restrictions would particularly help protect the environment in the parks during periods when they face the greatest pressure from visitors, on weekends and public holidays, he said.

Tourism activities that threaten national parks include diving and boating near coral reefs, K. Preecha has noted.

He also asked for cooperation from tour companies to better inform guides and tourists about activities that harmed the environment in national parks.

As head of the Marine National Park Operations Center 1, Somkiat Sunthornpitakkul is responsible for 17 national parks in Andaman region.

He admitted that after the DNP announced a price hike to

iting conservation needs, the Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation (DNP) recently announced new regulations, effective July 1, 2008, that will limit the number of tourists allowed to enter 10 national parks around the country deemed to be suffering from mass tourism.

Among them are Koh Similan and Koh Surin Marine National Parks, two of the most popular dive-tourism destinations in the world.

In addition, as of December 1, entry fees for foreigners at a number of less popular national parks were slashed from 400 baht to as low as 100 baht, in an effort to boost tourism there – but not at the Similan or Surin parks.

Gazette reporter Janyaporn Morel and News Editor Stephen Fein take a look at the changes and how they are likely to effect the two parks.

400 baht per head in 2006, the outcry among tour operators in the southern region led to the department allowing tour operators registered with the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) to buy vouchers from the DNP. The vouchers allowed them to continue bringing foreigners into the parks at the old rate of 200 baht per foreign visitor, effective until November 30 this year.

As a result, until recently, it was only a handful of non-TAT registered tour outfits along with foreign tourists traveling independently who were paying the full 400 baht rate.

Regarding the restrictions on the number of tourists allowed to enter the Similan and Surin parks, K. Somkiat said this change was largely unrelated to the fee structure.

He pointed out that the Similan and Surin parks only open

for six months a year, from November 15 to May 15, to allow nature to restore itself over the monsoon season.

The restrictions that take effect from July will help conserve natural resources at the parks, both of which receive approximately 100,000 visitors annually, he said.

However, he did not specify how many tourists would be allowed daily at the parks under the new regulation once it comes into effect.

On the revised fee structure, Thai Diving Association (TDA) Vice President Pragron Gategun said he felt it was reasonable to maintain the 400-baht fee on foreigners at the Similan and and Surin parks, which he described as "very overcrowded".

The TDA, which is playing a role in drawing up the new regulations of the dive-industry for the Surin and Similan parks, has also held meetings with NDP, TAT and Governor's office in recent weeks.

They also took part in a 2-day seminar organized by the

DNP at the Phuket Merlin Hotel late last month.

Chaired by K. Preecha, the gathering was attended by about 120 government officers, dive operators and marine tour operators to find ways to make dive tourism more sustainable.

A respected Phuket-based dive-boat operator from Europe, who asked that his name not be used, told the *Gazette* he found various reports about changes at the national parks confusing.


The operator, who is not a TDA member, said he had "heard talk" from other people in the industry that the number of divers allowed at sites inside the Similans National Park after July could be as low as 200 per day.

"If you look at the average

dive boat carrying 15 to 20 divers, you are looking at just 10 to 14 boats per day. What will the other 70 to 80 dive boats currently using these national parks do? This is going to be very tricky.

"Which dive companies will be allowed in? Which will be denied? Will this be the way Thai dive operators outmaneuver their foreign competitors? The issue is already getting politicized with the Thai Diving Association, which has held 'private' meetings with the national park service," he said.

"After a recent public hearing that I was unable to attend, a fellow dive boat operator told me that the the dive operators present were effectively told that the park service was 'not inter-

ested in saving dive companies, only in saving the coral reefs," he said.

It should be noted that more than 50% of the nation's coral reef is located inside national parks, according to figures from 2001 still shown on the DNP website. Coral beds inside the parks are generally healthier than those outside national parks, the website reads.

The foreign dive-boat operator told the *Gazette* the drastic measures now set to go in place could have been avoided had the DNP taken action on overcrowding problem earlier on.

"For many years I have argued the need to reduce pressure on the islands by reducing the number of divers and putting a moratorium on dive company registrations and licenses for dive boats allowed to enter the Similan and Surin parks. As always in Thailand, they are going to do something about it after the problem has gotten so bad that instead of a band-aid we now need drastic surgery," he said.

As for the lowering of the entrance fees for foreigners at many parks, he said it would likely have both positive and negative consequences.

However, he was pessimistic about the DNP's ability to effectively use the funds it collects from entry fees for conservation work.

"It s a sad situation that marine parks have been turned into cash cows without any of the

money being reinvested for park protection and investments. Similan Islands park staff spend all their time and energy collecting money – instead of looking after the park. Where all that money goes is also not transparent. I did the math and ...," he trailed off.

However, he admitted that an end of overcrowding at dive sites would be an undeniable benefit to the parks' ecosystems and make diving there more enjoyable for those lucky enough to be permitted entry.

"My high-end clients have been complaining for years that they are charged to enter a national park that is so overcrowded at dive sites that it resembles 'a circus'," he concluded.

Chalong buffalo rapist on the loose

PHUKET: Police are hunting a dangerous sex attacker who has raped and killed at least two innocent females in Chalong. The victims were not helpless young damsels, however, but 100-kilogram

The most recent attack was discovered in the morning of November 30. The victim's owner, who was not named in the report, found one of his eight buffaloes missing from his pen in Chalong Village

After a short search, the farmer found his missing charge lying tied to a tree stump – dead. The animal, a calf, showed signs of sexual assault.

Police believe the attacker had intercourse with the animal then inserted a large stick into its vagina, causing serious internal injuries that eventually killed it.

This is not the first victim of the dangerous deviant, however. A few weeks earlier, another calf was found dead in similar circumstances. In that incident, however, as the crime was not reported to police, officers could not take any action.

n increasing number of youths have attempted suicide and more students have admitted to having sexual affairs, according to a survey by child advocacy group Child Watch.

Of the 100,000 people aged under the age of 25 years surveyed, almost 34 of them reported attempting suicide, said Child Watch project director Amornwich Nakornthap.

According to the figures based on information collected between 2005 and 2006, the average rate of youth suicide attempts in that year was 21 a day.

Up to 19% of students surveyed in secondary schools and universities said they had had sex in 2006, up from 16% a year earlier, K. Amornwich said.

Increased sexual activity among students was also reflected in an increase in the number of teenagers younger than 19 years old delivering babies, which rose to 71,000 in 2006 from 52,000 in 2005, he added.

Dharma vacations. The Cabinet has approved a program that will allow female civil servants to take up to three months of paid leave for dharma practice once during their careers.

PMs Office Minister Khunying Dhipavadee Meksawan said that the move was launched as part of HM The King's birthday celebration this year

"His Majesty has emphasized that all civil servants should be virtuous and honest," she said.


Female civil servants interested in the program could apply to the National Buddhism Bureau, which would organize retreats for them, she said.

Under government regulations, male civil servants can take paid ordination leave once in their service and the leave can be for up to three months.

mauled and killed after she entered the farm with food and water for the horses.

upcoming general election.

"I had never imagined that such an attack would happen, but my wife usually carried a stick around and hit those dogs," the widower admitted.

He identified the two dogs who attacked his wife as "Beckham" and "Bamboo", both a mixed breed of local breed "Bang Kaew" and pitbull terrier.

The farm owner had already agreed to take responsibility, but police will investigate further to determine who should be held responsible as the owner of the dogs, which were brought in by workers to protect the horses.

Loan shark dragnet. The Bank of Thailand (BOT) and several other state agencies have launched a joint crackdown on

about 1,000 illegal non-bank companies and 5,000 illegal personal-loan providers nationwide.

Besides the illegal lenders, any party found guilty of collaborating with them, ranging from distributors of flyers for their services to newspapers that carry their advertisements, will be punished, regardless of whether their involvement is direct or indirect.

BOT director Weerachat Sribunma said the authorities wanted to suppress these illegal financial businesses completely because they not only burdened borrowers with high interest rates but also had an economic and social impact on the entire country

Pol Maj Gen Visut Vanichbut, head of the Economic and Cyber-Crime Division, warned that all activities related to illegal loans would be targeted. In the capital, the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration said it will impose the maximum fine of 2,000 baht on anyone found putting up posters or handing out leaflets advertising illegal loans.

Thai test for teachers. In a bid to enhance the Thai-language command of both teachers and students across the country, the Royal Institute will next year launch Thai-language proficiency tests for teachers.

The Royal Institute had prioritized Thai-language command among teachers because they were directly responsible for imparting knowledge of the language, said Royal Institute chairman Chai-anan Samudayanija.

"Tests would be for those teaching Thai language as well as other subjects," he said.

"National Institute of Educational Testing Service director Utumporn Jamornmann would chair the steering committee for the development of Thai-language standards," he added.

Voluntary Thai-language standardized tests would be used as an experiment among thousands of teachers in February and the results will be used to determine the teachers' average level of Thai-language knowledge. Actual tests could probably take place as early as April, she said.

Cashing out? A total of 142 divorce cases were sent to the Khon Kaen Civil Court in just three months, most of them Thai women seeking divorce from their western husbands, a senior judge said on December 8.

Patikorn Khonpipit, chief justice of the Juvenile and Family Court in Khon Kaen, said the divorce cases reached the court form July 1 to September 30.

"Most of the cases were filed by Thai women seeking divorce from their foreign husbands," he said.

Khon Kaen is a province where many Thai women marry foreigners. Many of them later became disillusioned so they filed for divorce, the judge said.

After a terribly long rainy season, it appears that the weather has finally shifted into high-season mode with lots of sun and blue cloudless skies over Khao Lak. However, the sea can still be quite rough, turning snorkeling and diving trips to the Similan or Surin islands into a queasy quest.

In general, it appears that the seasons are slowly shifting, with great weather from December to May, instead of November to April, as advertised throughout the world.

A fact most tourists aren't aware of is that May, or at least the first two to three weeks of May, is a great time to visit Khao Lak. At this time the sea is a calm liquid mirror and the chance to encounter manta rays and whale sharks is still high – also most hotels already offer low-season prices by this time.

This year, the number of tourists has definitely increased. Khao Lak's main road, especially the southern half, is packed with people after sunset. While restaurants in the area are crowded every night, shop owners and travel agents report that "people

are not buying". According to local shop owners, dive trips, adventure package and souvenir sales are still very slow, which is slightly disturbing given the large number of tourists.

Good news. After years of frequent flooding, Bang Niang beach road finally has a drainage sys-

All along Bang Niang road, new shops, restaurants and travel agencies are popping up like mushrooms. With several new shophouses nearly completed, it seems that Bang Niang road could become as busy as the pretsunami days.

Road repairs on the collapsed serpentine section of Petchkasem Rd, near Khao Lak

Lamru National Park, has finally begun. Most Khao Lak residents expected that tons of soil would be simply dumped into the gap and the road hastily repaired; the people responsible simply hoping the improvised repair job might last for an entire season.

Surprisingly though, it seems that reconstruction efforts are being planned precisely and professionally. Since mid-November, excavators, Caterpillars and a big team of construction workers have been reshaping the underlying part of the cliff that was washed away by heavy rainfall in September.

Terraces have been created and metal gauze boxes, with special porous plastic liners designed to withstand water pressure by allowing the water to flow through while holding the reinforcing rocks in place, are carefully being placed along the outside of each terrace level. It appears the problem has been solved and at least this part of Khao Lak's elevated serpentine road will be safe from collapsing again.

The howling. Khao Lak now has 12 optical shops. KT Optics, who already owned three outlets, has opened yet another two outlets, one at the new shopping plaza opposite Nang Thong supermarket and one at the new Emerald Plaza opposite Mukdara Resort on Bang Niang beach.

It looks like Khao Lak will soon have more optical shops than tailors. Perhaps something for the *Guinness Book of Records?* Khao Lak residents continue to wonder what optical shop owner's secret agenda might be. I guess we will never know...

Southern heroin drug ring busted

ollowing the arrest of two suspects at the end of last month, the Narcotics Suppression Bureau has confiscated assets worth more than 50 million baht from a drugsmuggling ring in Narathiwat.

The announcement was made on December 6 by Lt Gen Wuti Liptaphallop, commissioner of the Narcotics Suppression Bureau.

Gen Wuti said that Wirat Kheunphet, 35, and Sopha Kheunphet, 53, were arrested in possession of 12 kilograms of heroin.

Police also froze 10 bank accounts containing around 20 million baht. Assets seized included a house worth 5.5 million baht, two pickup trucks, a Honda SUV, a Seat sedan and a Honda motorcycle.


The two suspects were arrested in Narathiwat's Sungai Kolok district on November 28 following a tipoff that a pickup truck being kept in the car-care garage owned by the pair contained a substantial amount of heroin, Gen Wuti said.

Wirat and Sopha were arrested and charged with possession of a Class 1 drug with intent to sell.

The pair claimed that the car had been parked in their garage by Suphin Kheunphet and Santi Ahwae.

However, police found that the truck was registered to Pol Capt Phibun Thanitkul, an Investigating Officer at Cha-am District Police Station in Phetchburi and a former husband of Krongthong Natareuen, 36, a wellknown figure and suspected drug dealer in Narathiwat, Gen Wuti said.

Police contacted Capt Phibun, who they said claimed that he had given the pickup to Krongthong when they sepa-

rated. Police then requested arrest warrants for Krongthong, Suphin and Santi.

Capt Phibun, formerly stationed with the Sungai Kolok District Police, was transferred to Pathum Thani after allegations were made that he was connected to the narcotics trade.

On December 4, police sent a team to look for Krongthong at NP Mansion, an apartment block she owned jointly with yet another officer of the law, Cpl Thatsa Namahut, also with the Sungai Kolok District Police.

Police also searched a house in Pathum Thani that Krongthong had given to Cpl Thatsa.

Cpl Thatsa, who was at the announcement and claimed that he knew nothing about Krongthong's alleged drug dealing, called for Krongthong to give herself up to police.

Cop killed. Two youths have been arrested over the murder of a police senior sergeant major and his 20-year-old daughter, both stabbed to death in Satun on December 3.

Following an altercation with two young drinkers, Pol Sen Sgt Maj Sunthon Sangkaew, 42, and his daughter Alisa Sangkaew, 20, were stabbed to death in the karaoke bar owned by the officer. Witnesses reported that the dispute started after the drinkers attacked a waitress in the bar after she refused to sit with them.

Abdullahmid Yarang, 21, and a 15-year-old youth were arrested in a hut on a rubber plantation in Songkhla's Chana district on December 5.

The arrests were announced the following day by the Satun Provincial Police Commander Maj Gen Seri Wilailak, who said that they had confessed to the killing and had been charged with murder.

Numeric narcotic. A man was arrested for possession of *kra*-

thom following a raid at a hut in a rubber plantation, a known youth hangout in Songkhla's Saba Yoi district December 4.

Ismail Deuramae, 25, was allegedly with friends drinking "four times one hundred" – a drug made from *krathom* boiled with cough syrup and mosquito repellent and drunk with cola – when police led by Ban Not Police Deputy Inspector Lt Wirachat Sreeree burst in with guns at the ready.

On seeing the lawmen, the hut's occupants quickly fled. Apart from Ismail, all managed to escape.

Police seized 20 kilograms of fresh *krathom* leaves and 15 liters of prepared *krathom* extract. Ismail was charged with possession of a Class 5 drug.

Mystery victims. Police are looking into the identities of two victims of a powerful explosion at an open-air restaurant that killed six people in Pattani on the night of December 4, suspicious that they might have been the bombers.

The day after the blast, Pattani Governor Panu Uthairat said that police had been unable to uncover any evidence that could be used to identify two of the victims, both teenage boys.

As their bodies were found very close to the bomb, police were investigating whether they were involved in the attack, he added.

The bomb, planted inside a motorbike, exploded near a crowded restaurant in Muang district. Two people died at the scene and four died later in hospital.

o the uninitiated, the mention of yoga usually provokes images of contortions that only the most flexible of people blessed with "bendy bones" can perform and only after years of strenuous practice.

These images can put people off the idea of even trying yoga. Mention "hot yoga" and the mind boggles as to why on earth someone would want to spend time bending about in a room that is hotter than the tropical heat outside.

According to yoga instructor Lina Zapata, who teaches hot yoga classes at Bliss Hot Yoga at Central Festival, even the most zealous yoga practitioners had similar feelings before embarking on body bending and breathing exercises.

"Given the chance, though, most people who try yoga for the first time realize that it's not as difficult as it looks and immediately feel the benefits of a cardiovascular workout that refreshes the mind and body," Lina said.

As the foreign and local, young and old, male and female yoga apprentices arrive at Bliss Yoga, they are greeted warmly before changing and warming up in the heated hot yoga studios.

Some like it hot

Members sign in with a fingerprint scanner that automatically keeps track of the members' sessions for their particular package. The database also keeps details of locker numbers and any other information that helps make the sessions hassle-free.

The classes are casual, friendly affairs comprising students of all levels so no-one feels inadequate, whatever their skill level or experience. The instructions are simple to follow and members are not under pressure to outperform each other.

sidered a fad for females, men who try yoga often enjoy the physical challenge and quickly discover the range of benefits it has for the body and life in general, as it is said to help clear the mind of the stresses of modern life. "More and more men are joining the yoga classes these

Although yoga is often con-

"More and more men are joining the yoga classes these days. They soon discover the physical and mental benefits of yoga, such as weight loss and becoming better focused in everyday life. Men also enjoy the challenge of yoga and they discover that they can perform some moves better than women can," Lina explained.

"Egos are left behind when people come into the yoga rooms. Everyone is different and they each have their own abilities or limitations, no matter how long they have studied yoga," Lina added.

"It's also quite safe for pregnant women to do yoga. Although I wouldn't advise women who have never done yoga before to start if they are in the first three months of pregnancy, but all the yoga practitioners I know who have become pregnant will continue with their regular yoga sessions right up until the day before they give birth.

"In fact, yoga helps condition the body for giving birth as it widens the hips," said Lina.

There are separate changing and shower rooms for men and women and the classes are mixed. There are often just as many men as women taking part in the classes, she added.

The mirrored yoga classrooms are warmed by heaters specially imported from Germany that circulate and humidify the air.

Although additional heat may seem strange in a place as hot as Phuket, the hot and humid room allows the ligaments to stretch more easily and also helps to detoxify the body as toxins are sweated out during the exercises and washed away with perspiration.

"The walls are lined with mirrors, not for vanity, but it helps students see for themselves whether they are performing a posture correctly. A quick look in the mirror will tell you if your hips are out of line or your feet are placed properly," said Lina.

Classes start with "centering", which helps the mind focus for the session with simple breathing exercises and movements that prepare the mind and body for the stretching that will follow:

Patrick Catellani has been attending the yoga classes for five months. He said that taking up yoga has changed his life. Like many, he first became interested in yoga as a gentle way to keep fit and lose some weight, but soon found that the regular sessions have been much more beneficial than just losing a few pounds.

"Yoga has changed my whole outlook on life. I feel really good all the time and I have to do it regularly. When I travel, I worry about where I will be able to practice because if I don't do it then I feel as if I'm really missing out on something," he said.

"Having an instructor talking you through a yoga session is important as well. It helps keep you focused and the teacher can give you pointers whenever you need to adjust your posture or breathing," Patrick added.

However, Lina is used to hearing all sorts of excuses for people not trying yoga, but she says that all it takes are just a couple of sessions to get people hooked.

"The most common excuse I hear is 'I just don't have time', but, in fact, people soon discover that doing yoga actually gives you more time. It refreshes you and gives you an energy top-up when you're tired to carry on for the day," she said.


"Apart from the physical benefits, yoga eventually leads to spiritual development because the mind is getting in touch with the body, which helps you listen to and understand your body's needs." Lina said.

"Spiritually, I feel much more accepting of the things that happen to me on a daily basis. It's easier to cope with the trials that a fast-paced life throws at you because it's easier to focus and put things into perspective without getting stressed," she added.

A taste of Bordeaux at the Boathouse

ood wine improves with age and there is no doubt about it – the older I get, the better it tastes, so the old joke goes. Before I broach the subject, I must salute the more-savvy-than-I wine lovers on the island and ask, "Hey, where were you on the evening of November 29?"

I pose this question because this was when Mom Tri's Boathouse Wine & Grill, winner of many wine-related gongs and no slouch in the fabulously full wine-cellar department, hosted Messrs Hubert de Bouard de Laforest and Gildas d'Ollone of Chateau Angelus and Chateau Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande estates — both situated near the Atlantic coast in Bordeaux.

The two wine producers, representing the biggest names in the Gironde region, guided guests through a tasting of four labels from each vineyard.

The Boathouse rustled up some gourmet eats and, with a combination like that, everyone attending knew they were in for a treat.

The evening promised to be highly entertaining as it was graced with the presence of a rich mix of wine lovers on the island from all walks of life, and even a few property dealers.

Opening with Champagne on the upstairs terrace, old faces greeted each other, new faces were introduced and a healthy and diverse sprinkling of languages cut through the starry, seaside night air – it was magic.

Before we settled in, Louis Bronner, the Boathouse general manager, introduced his two distinguished visitors in his usual polyglot manner and then promptly sat down to leave Monsieur Bouard to explain the more



succulent aspects of his produce.

"Wine is a living product," began the well-groomed vintner. "Each bottle is a different entity. This is the result of the individual sugar of the grape. You'll not find this variance with Beaujolais, for example – this is pure wine with no additions."

Monsieur d'Ollone, in his introductory speech, used age as an analogy when describing labels of this quality. "The older the wine, the more differing it is. Cheap wine is a little like underexercised people – they have to be helped upstairs – whereas good wine is like elderly people who have danced and exercised all their lives – it's full of life."

If you've never tried the Boathouse's pan-seared duck liver over wild mushrooms, I recommend that you do. It's perfectly yielding and every mouthful is a gourmet's delight. That, along with the Chateau Bernadotte 1999 Haut-Medoc and La Fleur de Bouard 2003, Lalande de Pomerol, provided a fabulous

point de depart.

Monsieur de Bouard's family has owned his vineyard since 1782 and he is not only the owner but an enologist in his own right. "It's easy to make wine, not so easy to make good wine and extremely difficult to make great wine," he said.

The Fleur de Bouard profits from an outstanding taste in a Merlot style, whereas the Bernadotte, according to Monsieur d'Ollone, is an "everyday wine". Far from it – it may be young, but its tannin is outstanding and sure to mature magnificently.

The next course, rock lobster ravioli with black-truffle cream sauce, was accompanied by a Carrillon de l'Angelus 2005 St Emilion and Reserve de la Comtesse 1995.

The Reserve was well-received with its spicy and well-balanced body, while the Carrillon was an easy-going tipple. The ravioli was top notch.

The Boathouse is known for its lamb dishes and as this was the next course, there was an air of expectation as a Chateau Angelus 1995 and Chateau Pichon Comtesse 1995 were poured.

The lamb was great, but what about the wines? Monsieur Bouard smiled and said, "Everything went well that year." The Angelus is a complex wine with a black cherry nose, spicy and well balanced.

The Chateau Pichon leans toward a Merlot, but this is unsurprising as Pichon-Lalande wines typically have in the region of 30% to 40% Merlot influence in them.

For a wine to stand up well against a cheese platter of Mimolette Extra-Vielle and Brillat Savarin Cremeux, it has to be full-bodied and have a bit of a kick. Mimolette, by the way, is an extra-aged cheese, usually produced in Flanders.

This Mimolette, however,

was French produced and extremely tasty. The Savarin was heavenly – an explosion of lightly-spiced cream in the mouth – and the Angelus 2001 obliged beautifully – a complex wine, aging well and delivering freshness by the sip.

"Good church windows," commented Alexander Mack, the towering executive chef at Amari Coral Beach Resort. No one quite understood him and when pressed, he cryptically answered, "Kirchenfenster."

We all nodded sagely, wondering what the heck he was on about. Later, Alex explained that the German expression means that the Angelus has striking "legs", meaning that it leaves noticeable traces down the empty glass, a little like a good pint of Guinness leaving its mark on the glass after each mouthful.


Fine wine legs are vertical, instead of horizontal. The Chateau Pichon was a worthy companion to these sensational cheeses and by this time the room was buzzing with wine conversations and anecdotes.


It was wonderful to be at such a cultured and appreciative gathering, but time was getting on and I had to hit the road. I was greeted with looks of blank astonishment.

"Some of us have a day job, you know," I muttered as a croquant tart with pear and almonds was served.

"Wine is the most civilized thing in the world," Hemingway wrote, probably between large gulps of Cuban sugar-cane rum while celebrating his pre-lunch marlin harpooning.

If this is so, then that makes me uncivilized for leaving such a gathering so early. Call me a heathen, but a somewhat enlightened one after November 29 at the Boathouse.

Happily Ever After A hundred years

adame Fernande Marie-Louise Rouve-Bronner has witnessed a century. On October 15, 2007 she celebrated her 100th birthday with friends and family at Mom Tri's Boathouse. After being a seasonal resident in Phuket for 18 years, Madame Bronner moved to the island in 2003 and now lives in a hillside villa overlooking Kata

Her 67-year-old son, Louis Bronner, lives down the hill from her, serving as the general manager of Mom Tri's Boathouse.

"I would like to speak English with you, but I have forgotten," she says, hinting slight frustration before proceeding to speak clearly in French.

She is poised in a wheelchair wearing a blue flowered dress, her burgundy-brown hair pulled up in a tight bun. While her skin and wheelchair denote old age, her blue eyes remain lucid and piercing; eyes that have seen two World Wars, a technology explosion and a tsunami, and continue to consume literature on a daily

Madame Bronner devoted her life to education. After becoming the first college graduate in her family and one of the first women to graduate from her university, she taught three generations of students in France during her teaching career of more than 40 years.

Madame Bronner was born in Aveyron, in the south of France. The youngest of six siblings, she grew up on her family's farm in Vabres-l'Abbaye.

At the age of 10 her scholarly aptitude was already apparent and her pious family was shocked when her elder sister persuaded her to attend a public school rather than a Catholic

"I still had to visit the priest twice a week to study the Catechism," she recalls. "One day when our whole family was at church, the priest announced to the congregation, 'Even though Madame Fernande attends the school of the Devil, she is the best at Catechism!' My father was very proud."

is a resident of Kata who recently celebrated her centennial birthday. As a French school teacher, adame Fernande Marie-Louise Rouve-Bronner she has lived through two World Wars and taught three generations of students over a 40-year career as a teacher.

The Gazette's Skyler Swezy recently met Madame Bronner to see what pearls of wisdom she had to offer the younger people of Phuket.

remembers tracking the German advance. A large map was hung on the classroom wall and every day the students listened to war reports on the radio and marked the front lines with small French and German flags.

After secondary school, Madame Bronner left the farm to attend the University of Toulouse, where she developed a heavy caffeine addiction and excelled in mathematics, physics and chem-

"My father said, 'You will not work on the farm; you will study.' I put all my energy into studying and became the worst coffee drinker you can imagine, drinking seven to eight espressos a day," she recalls.

Madame Bronner studied voraciously to surpass her male peers and was the only woman in her class to pass her department's probation period. Sometimes she bought books instead of food, drawing her parents' concern when she returned to the farm much skinnier during the holidays.

"I received my diploma, then In school during WWI, she returned home and proudly pre-

sented it to my father. He said, 'Gosh, I would prefer that, instead of having a diploma, you look a little better. Now go to the kitchen and eat," she says.

Although passionate about pursuing a doctorate in medicine or engineering, a lack of educational funding prompted Madame Bronner to choose a career in teaching. "My father could no longer afford to pay for my education, so I decided to become a teacher," she says. She began teaching at the age of 23 and worked steadily until retiring at

One of her most vivid memories of WWII stems from a moment right before the bloodshed began. "I was rushing to the farm after receiving news of my mother's death," she recalls.
"Preparing myself to face the shock of seeing my dead mother, I rounded the last corner and came upon a young soldier walking down my street. He was in uniform, on his way to get on a train and go to war. The year was 1940."

In 1945, Madame Bronner



and her husband, an architect helping to rebuild their country, moved to Alsace and then to Paris. In the wake of the war, she found herself with up to 70 students in a class, ranging from seven to 20 years old.

Her son recalls her being a strict but fair teacher. "There was order in her class but she had good relations with everyone. If it was time for a joke she made it, but when it was over, it was over," says Louis.

"When we moved to Paris, a lot of the students were German Jews and it was impossible for me to pronounce their names. One day, while calling roll, the way I pronounced a student's name sounded like 'shit' in German. All the students began laughing so I banged the table and a glass broke. After that, nobody dared move a finger.

"Those were hard days, teaching 70 students in one class. I would go home and go straight to bed," she says.

She was the only teacher in her school who required her students to wear uniforms, which prevented clothing from being used as a representation of economic class. She also refused to distinguish any children as better than others by declining to issue awards at the end of a school

"My principle was that every student is good. There will be no first or last," she says.

Madame Bronner taught

the children and grandchildren of her former students. She was scheduled to retire at the age of 60, but insisted on teaching four

When her teaching days were over, she became an avid reader, and still is today. When former French Ambassador Laurent Abulin gave her a novel by W. Somerset Maugham, she read it in a few hours then exclaimed, "Why did I have to wait until I was 98 to discover this fantastic book?"

After living through a century of changes, Madame Bronner doesn't believe technological advancements necessarily equate to better quality of life. "Television has become a catastrophe because it's addictive. People lose any taste for opening a book," she says.


Madame Bronner doesn't consider her longer-than-average life as amazing and declines to designate a specific period as her happiest. "I have enjoyed almost everything. If I had a preference, it would be proof of egoism."

She is anything but egotistical. Her son Louis says, "When I asked her if she wanted to conduct this interview, she said, 'Why do they want to interview me? I'm not special.'

"I would describe this as distinguished humility," he adds.

Madame Bronner leans forward in her wheelchair, opens her eyes wide and says in clear English, "If you understand me, no compliments."





"It was fantastic to see teams with little or no previous experience improve so well on their previous times, and to race so well."

All teams raced in three heats, with the four teams with the fastest heat times over the 220-meter course going through to the final, which was raced during a typical Phuket downpour.

Novotel Panwa won the title with a time of 42.7 seconds and will go to Penang July next year to compete in the world championships.

Rawai Relics, whose crew had an average age of 45, crossed the finish line 0.56 seconds later.

Shades put in a sterling effort to place third with a time 44.7 followed closely by Rajabaht University, who were paddling on



Diva gets down at Indigo

leaming like "a pearl in the rough", Indigo Pearl is a luxury resort tucked away next to Nai Yang Beach. Sufficiently far away from densely-populated areas of the island, the resort offers a different kind of vibe to most places in Phuket.

Of the many dining and lounging options available there, only one is the hang-out of a reallife diva. "That's D-I-V-A," as she'll tell you. Rebar is in a hip little corner of the resort and it's where you'll find "the northwest's own diva", May Palmer, performing jazz, gospel, funk, soul – whatever takes her

Time is running out though, because May, originally from Providence, Rhode Island, will be at Rebar only until the end of December.


Rebar is cool in every sense of the word. After a brief saunter through the resort, a flight of stairs leads up to the open-air bar where a slight scent of cigars lingers in the air. It is suitably dark without being gloomy, creating an ambiance that encapsulates the chilled-out atmosphere that makes the place ideal for pre-club drinks or, better yet, a hot date where you want to be somewhere quiet enough to chat.

The bar has a chic feel to it, with comfortable chairs, wooden flooring, walls and beams, views of the resort grounds and, before May Palmer takes to the stage, background music from Swedish DJ Tommy Karlsson.

As the night wears on, The Boom band rattles off a few numbers before May Palmer struts her way to the stage. Enigmatic, extravagant, extrovert – it's hard to sum up a woman with a rare voice, with power, soul and range.

"I take singing seriously because I believe my fans deserve a great night out," said May. May can back up her claims with a voice as powerful and full of life as you'll ever hear in Phuket.

A true diva, May dances,



hand – all while keeping her commanding voice in tune and on point. May brings enthusiasm and energy to an otherwise peaceful bar. Phuket just ain't big enough for this diva and she will soon fly the coop and return to the Washing State to spend some time with her husband of 17 years, Bob.

While she's here, you can catch May performing Tuesday through Saturday between 7 pm and 10 pm. On Sundays, May is on hand to entertain people during brunch at the Tin Mine Restaurant, another venue at Indigo Pearl.

May's style is raucous, loud and intense. Steamrolling through covers of Dock of the Bay, Mustang Sally and I Heard it Through the Grapevine, May explores a variety of musical styles with her love of gospel shining through – May first started singing in churches along the American east coast in her late

Her latest CD, Mo' May: A Celebration Of The Motown Era, is available at the resort.

Catching May Palmer at Rebar is an entertaining way to start your night. The bar itself is open only until 11 pm. The idea of late-night drinking in a venue as swish as Rebar would likely tempt many to stay beyond the curfew. As it is, Rebar is a place

For early-starters, Rebar opens at 5 pm and doubles as a restaurant serving tapas, seafood, Thai dishes and Japanese fare.

Items on the food menu are reasonably priced for the highend guests Indigo caters to, hovering a little below 300 baht for dishes such as crispy coconut prawns with plum sauce; grilled chorizo with paprika potatoes; and sautéed mussels with bell peppers, parsley and white wine sauce.

The food warrants a sampling and the drinks menu has all the usual suspects, including a wicked range of cocktails priced about 250 baht a glass. The mojito was tangy and refreshing while other offerings were intoxicating and full of tropical flavors. A bottle of wine will set you back on average between 1,500 baht and 3,000 baht.

A trip to Rebar will likely leave a dent in your wallet, but for island folk who don't usually get to venture off the beaten track, it's worth it.

aureen Dowd is a cruel woman. Upon the gentle, compassionate, middle-ofthe-road presidential candidate Barack Obama, the New York Times columnist has pinned a pet nickname: "Obambi". In a recent column, she mocked Obambi for feeling hurt that Hillary Clinton doesn't like him. Rudy Giuliani, she notes, couldn't care less.

Following his political autobiography Dreams From My Father, Obama has now written his campaign manifesto, The Audacity of Hope (Three Rivers Press, New York, 2006, 375pp).

Now this is a pretentious title, but it bears some truth. Obama is nothing if not audacious. After his 17 minutes of fame as the keynote speaker at the 2004 Democratic convention, the freshman senator leaped into the presidential race two years later, pre-empting Hillary, and proceeded to drum up more campaign funds, predominately in small bills.

"Thoughts on Reclaiming the American Dream" is the book's subtitle. Obama must be given credit for his effort. He wrote the book himself, unlike John Kennedy, who had his college roommate Lem Billings write *Profiles in Courage*, or Hillary Clinton, who famously stiffed her ghostwriters. And no less than the New York Times' Michiko Kakatani, the doyenne of American book critics, had this

cian, who can actually write - and write movingly and genuinely about himself ... [He] strives in these pages to ground his policy thinking in simple common sense... while articulating these ideas in levelheaded, nonpartisan prose."

I was pleasantly surprised by the quality of the prose. On the fourth page of his prologue, he speaks about the ambition that led him to make an abortive try for a congressional seat after seven years in the Illinois state legislature:

"I began to harbor doubts about the path I had chosen; I began feeling the way I imagine an actor or athlete must feel when, after years of commitment to a particular dream, after years of waiting tables

between auditions or scratching out hits in left him with a huge voting record that his the minor leagues, he realizes that he's gone just about as far as talent or fortune will take him. The dream will not happen, and he now faces the choice of accepting this fact like a grown-up and moving on to more sensible pursuits, or refusing the truth and ending up bitter, quarrelsome, and slightly pathetic."

Now that is a finely crafted sentence and there are plenty of them in this book. There's also plenty of preachy political boilerplate, but that's the nature of a presidential campaign book. He spends an entire chapter yammering on about American "values", stuff like "hard work, patriotism, personal responsibility, optimism and faith".

This provoked in this reader the dreaded MEGO syndrome: My Eyes Glaze Over. He retook my attention, though, with a realistic chapter on politics. He offers a meticulous description of the tightrope that an American senator must walk between raising campaign funds and caving in to special interests, between cooperation and surrender to the ruling party, between opening up to reporters and being clobbered by them.

Seven years in the Illinois legislature

political opponents will comb through to find damaging votes. Once, for example, he mistakenly voted against a bill to protect children from sex offenders. He had accidentally pressed the wrong button on the bill and had it immediately corrected in the official record.

"Somehow I don't think that portion of the official record will make it into a Republican ad," says his media adviser David Axelrod.

"Anyway, cheer up," he adds, clapping Obama on the back. "I'm sure this will help you with the sex offender vote."

Another shameless aspect of American politics is the fierce gerrymandering that ensures that instead of throwing the rascals out at election time, "Year after year we keep the rascals right where they are, with the re-election rate for House members hovering at around 96%.

His conclusion? "Indeed, it's not a stretch to say that most voters no longer choose their representatives; instead, representatives choose their voters."

When you're "I" but want to refer to yourself again in the same sentence, even if only for emphasis, then you're "myself". For example, "I will write myself a reminder" and "I will get back to you myself."



National parks need a holiday

Imminent reductions in the number of tourists allowed to enter the Koh Similan and Koh Surin Marine National Parks in Phang Nga are necessary-yet-painful measures to protect marine ecosystems there from the effects of poorly-regulated mass tourism from which they currently suffer (see Inside Story, pages 4-5).

Thanks to their remoteness, the two marine parks are among the last great dive-tourism destinations Thailand has to offer, where the crystal-clear waters serve as a saddening reminder to anyone who visits them of what water conditions off Phuket were like just a few decades ago before the onset of mass tourism here.

While the relatively pristine conditions at the parks are perhaps still unique in Thailand, they are not unique in the greater region. Phuket-based dive operators are already beginning to shun the two parks due to the overcrowded conditions, described by some as "a circus" because of the numbers of divers there during peak periods.

Some Phuket-based operators are conducting tours to more remote sites in India and Burma, despite the added difficulty involved with customs, immigration and a slew of other problems not least of which is the distance from Phuket and the fuel and time needed to reach them.

It is indeed distressing that Thailand's final frontiers for dive tourism now find themselves subject of the same kinds of remarks commonly directed to popular land-based tourist destinations such as Patong Beach: cash cow, unregulated, overrun with tourists... spoiled.

While the Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation (DNP) should be commended for finally taking serious steps to protect the parks, it should also be warned that implementing and enforcing the measures, day-to-day, fairly and transparently, will be a far greater challenge than issuing them.

The DNP also needs to do a better job of protecting marine parks from illegal fishing, which is far more destructive than dive tourism.

The problems facing the two famous marine parks and the dive industry that relies upon them are just a small microcosm of the much larger environmental challenges facing planet Earth as the year 2007 draws to an end.

We can only hope that today's children will not visit the Similans for the first time 20 years from now only to find conditions resembling the Phi Phi Islands Marine National Park of today.

We hope that the government that will form after the next election will take a more serious approach to environmental issues and sustainable tourism than its predecessors.



Big drive for voter turnout

ith the forthcoming elections, this is indeed an important month. The government has requested each provincial administration campaign to have voter turn-out reach at least 70% of eligible voters and for spoiled ballots to be fewer than 3% of the total.

To achieve this, I have asked the election board to clearly explain the new voting procedures to the public. I want people to get out and vote on December 23.

We have organized events with colleges and universities urging students aged 18 years old and up to vote. We have also been in contact with the Phuket Labor Office to ask for help from the private sector, such as hotels and restaurants, requesting them to give their staff paid leave to enable them to vote.

The government has announced that December 24 will be a public holiday for the whole of Thailand, thus allowing voters registered in other provinces more time to travel back to their home districts to vote without missing

On December 14, we will hold a big "get-out-and-vote" campaign in Phuket as part of a nationwide effort that day to help achieve the central government's target of 70% voter turn-out.

I recently met with Sawai Promjinda, Chairman of the Phuket Society of Disabled Persons. In Phuket, there are about 2,000 persons with various disabilities who are eligible to vote. Most of them are visually impaired, so for them we have prepared special ballots.

Governor's Letter

he last governor's letter of 2007 comes at a crucial juncture for Thailand - just before the December 23 general election. For the sake of the country, Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit urges everybody with the right to vote to use it.

Gov Niran is confident that after the forthcoming elections the new central government will allocate increased funding to Phuket so that the island will be able to tackle important issues

including tourism development, traffic, waste disposal and pollution in general.

Optimistic about 2008, Gov Niran also takes this opportunity to wish all *Gazette* readers a happy and prosperous new year.

tion will have a definite impact on the Phuket economy, because the present central government has not allocated any budgets for provincial development projects so that we can effectively compete with neighboring countries.

We want to improve the island's infrastructure and move ahead with several megaprojects. I think that after we have a new central government, we will see improvements in this

The three provinces in our economic development cluster – Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi are expected to generate about 100 million baht in tourism revenue this year. In Phuket alone, we expect to generate about 80 million baht from some five million tourist visits. If you compare that to the country's entire tourism revenue it's about half of the total amount, so we need and deserve more budget support than we currently receive.

Right now, we face a lot of problems getting needed support for our tourism industry. Phuket tourism is like a bubble waiting to burst. For example, we promoted tourism ourselves [through roadshows around the world] and got people to come here, but there are problems with the airport – it is not big enough to accommodate the planes carrying all the tourists who want to visit; there is also insufficient parking.

If we have about seven buses waiting to shuttle tourists from the airport, other vehicles have no space to park. We have a similar problem when three or four buses drop tourists off at the airport, creating long queues of people waiting to check in and have their bags scanned.

It's the same at the immigration booths and passport control when a number of large planes land at the same time. The problem of the limousine drivers and metered-taxi drivers accosting tourists as they leave the airport is another long-standing issue that needs to be resolved.

We also have problems with traffic jams, pollution and garbage, all of which need to be addressed. We just haven't had an adequate budget since I took over as governor here.

Hidden population: After we launched the mobile-registration van at Banthai Beach Resort & Spa on November 13, we had a lot of positive responses. On the first day, we had more than 100 people transfer to Phuket [house

registration forms]. When you think about how many hundreds of hotels there are in Phuket, you can begin to see that the total number of potential registrants is

We hope this effort leads to more accurate accounting of the actual number of people living on the island.

Crime involving tourists: Almost every day I receive reports about crime, with some cases involving tourists. Phuket is now very different from in the past because we have people from every one of Thailand's 76 provinces living here. Wherever there are tourists, there will be some people who try and take advantage of the situation. This presents opportunities to drug dealers and others with criminal intentions. It's a great concern for

I still ask friends and people I know to take care if they go out at night – not only women, but men too. There have been many cases of muggings by motorcycle gangs occurring at about 2 am in the morning.

Best of luck for 2008: I would like to wish everyone in Phuket happiness and good luck for the new year. I hope that people will take care of their bodies as well as their minds so that they can live quality lives. My tip for the new year is to eat good food and exercise. Please take care of yourselves.

Working in Thailand on a retirement visa

I plan to move to Thailand in 2008 and will arrive with a retirement

As I cannot work on a retirement visa, I would like to know whether it is possible to get a work permit with the retirement visa if I decide to work or if the visa needs to be changed.

If so, what kind of visa should I apply for?

Pol Capt Krissarat Nuesen of the Phuket Provincial Immigration Office replies:

You can use the retirement visa for your stay here, but if you want to work, you must cancel your retirement visa and request the non-immigrant B visa from a Thai embassy or consul outside Thailand.

The war on critters: zap them with drugs

Making Tracks I looked at the pests that can inflict life-threatening conditions on dogs and cats. All of these conditions are preventable, so this month I will take a look at what the drug companies have manufactured to help us win the war against critters.

Animal diseases that have been virtually eradicated in the West, such as parvo virus and canine distemper in dogs and cat flu in cats, are common in Asia.

All puppies and kittens should have a full course of vaccinations and at least their first annual booster.

Studies carried out in the US have concluded that it is unnecessary to have boosters every year as the animal will have sufficient immunity already. Some people argue that pumping live vaccines into an animal every year can be harmful. Local vets still believe it is better to vaccinate annually because of the preva-

in the previous edition of lence of these diseases in Thailand. It is up to owners to make the choice.

> Ticks and fleas that cause misery to animals and occasionally induce life-threatening conditions are easily controlled. I had a call this week from a monk to say that one of the temple dogs was sick. The dog was in surgery at a local vet fighting for its life suffering from advanced babesia, which is carried by ticks and is one of the biggest causes of dog death on the island.

The two most common products to tackle these pests are Frontline and Revolution. Both are available at veterinary surgeries on the island and at many pet shops. The most popular method is to buy sachets of liquid avail-

able in different sizes depending on the weight of the animal.

Once a MAKINGTRACKS month, you part the animals fur on its neck or

between the shoulder blades and apply the liquid directly to the skin. You should apply the liquid to this area so that the animal cannot lick it off. It is also important not to bathe the animal for three days before and after application.

Frontline is also available in spray form and this will kill fleas instantly if the animal is infested. The sachets take effect after a day or two. Frontline Plus also kills flea eggs. Make sure you buy the correct application as some dog-flea products can be dangerous for cats.

Frontline does not protect against heartworm and an additional medication, such as Heartguard, should be used. Revolution claims to protect against heart-

Personally, I have found both Frontline and Revolution to be effective. You ought to try both with your pet to see which is most effective.

maggots effectively. Some vets mix it with iodine to reach into deep wounds and flush maggots out. I often apply this powder to dogs with small wounds that are not already infected because it prevents maggots and helps dry and heal the injury.

If your dog develops a rash and some hair loss near the tail and on the lower back, it probably has a flea-bite allergy that should disappear after a few weeks using Frontline or Revolution. If your dog starts to lose hair elsewhere, then it may be infected with either sarcoptic mange or demodec mange.

You should take your dog to a vet and ask for a skin test to ascertain which form of mange the animal has because the treat-

> ments differ. Whichever form of mange it is, your vet will treat it with Ivomec orally on a daily basis for demodec mange;

orally or by injection on a weekly basis for sarcoptic mange. Only sarcoptic mange can be transmitted from dog to dog.

By Top Dog

Ivomec has yet to be approved for use on dogs and cats in the West, but it has been used throughout the world for treatment of parasites on other animals for years. It is the active ingredient in Heartguard. It can be dangerous if used on collie breeds, but is safe on all other dogs providing the dosage instructions are followed.

Many people have commented to me that over the past few years, there has been a marked reduction in the number of stray dogs suffering from mange. This is mostly because thousands of dogs have been treated with Ivomec by the Soi Dog Foundation.

Some scientific papers claim it is ineffective against ticks, but in Phuket, we can see evidence that it does kill them. Although the injection can cause pain to a dog, the product is inexpensive.

A risk management strategy involves accepting that bad things will happen and planning for them, instead of futilely trying to avoid them.

Unfortunately, what the bigsecurity-vendor, snake-oil salesmen currently peddle is nothing more than risk identification, what Andrew Jaquith refers to as the dreaded "hamster wheel of pain".

These people are only good at telling you that you have problems and that they'll be happy to perpetually help you identify and fix them – for a large fee, of course.

If your security vendor can't answer simple questions such as, "Is my security better this year?," "What am I getting for my money?," and "How does my security compare with that of my peers?" then hold on to your wallet and keep your money safe.


Risk audits, risk assessments and risk modeling are all noteworthy endeavors, but without metrics – including the ability to make quantifiable comparisons among peers and competitors – then risk management is a hollow and meaningless term that is constantly misused.

Data-loss prevention (also known as data-leak prevention/protection, information loss/leak prevention/protection, extrusion prevention, content monitoring and filtering/protection) works by keeping track of information and its whereabouts.

The notion of a security perimeter for protection is difficult to pin down and as a result, tracking valuable information at the file-object level makes sense.

The bad news for the security vendors is that they had to pay over the odds to acquire the technology to incorporate into their solution products.

Looking out for number one



Software vendors typically sell only risk-identification solutions, creating the inevitable "Hamster Wheel of Pain" while leaving you none the wiser as to how to actually solve your security problems.

Symantec, for example, paid US\$350 million to acquire California-based data-loss-prevention specialist firm Vontu – even while undergoing its own global downsizing effort.

The good news is that this area of security is becoming commoditized so you will barely see a hiccup of a price hike.

Fortunately, risk management and data-loss prevention are

both easy to implement at the consumer level.

You have a pretty basic idea of what your assets are: personal information, such as email and photos; intellectual property produced during your career; and private information, such as details relating to bank and credit card accounts.

Almost all data leaks are caused by human error. Nick

Selby, an analyst with the 451 Group, divvies it up as follows: 98% stupid or inadvertent actions; 1.5% due to modestly-skilled thieves and 0.5% because of targeted attacks by trained, skilled users with a motive.

As far as data-loss preven-

tion is concerned, you control your own destiny.

The degree of protection you need depends on your Internet surfing habits. I don't open emails

from unknown sources; I don't click on XXX links; I don't download cracked (pirated) software; I don't download free stuff using BitTorrent; I don't play fantasy role-play games, indulge in online gambling or watch porn; and I regularly run full-system scans and do backups.

But, of course, as with most things, most people don't do as I do – the risk you want to take is up to you.

Here's part one of a list of things you can do to protect yourself:

Antivirus Software and Personal Firewall

You can't be on the Internet and have no data exchange. The minimum security software protection is antivirus software and a personal firewall.

If you are a careful Internet surfer, you can easily get by with the free, built-in firewalls that come with Windows XP, Mac OS X and all Linux flavors, as well as with free and open-source antivirus software, such as Clam or AVG

If you are a "bad" surfer and do one of the bad things that I don't do, I highly recommend

spending up to 3,000 baht or so on an endpoint protection solution because you are at risk from spybots, rootkits, phishing attacks and more. You

will need to protect yourself to at least stave off the inevitable.

Automatic Updates

Every major operating system (OS) and software maker provides automatic updates, which include security patches. Check to make sure this feature is turned on and use it.

I use the option to be notified before any type of installation occurs, mainly because I want to catch Microsoft trying to download unwanted crap onto my systems.

OS vendors also offer system backup and recovery software, which is fine, but must be tested by the user before relying on it.

Back up regularly


Fortunately, if the bad guys compromise your laptop or PC, they aren't interested in destroying your data – they just want to use it for as long as possible.

Still, there are hard-drive failures and accidental deletions to worry about. I backup once a month and in between, I backup valuable files to a thumb drive.

It's easy once you get into the habit, and I suggest you do the same.





he outlook for 2008 is difficult to assess. Some areas are obvious. For example, in most of the US, the residential housing market will continue to deteriorate. Many housing loans taken out in recent years are scheduled to reset to higher interest rate levels in 2008 as part of the original


agreement. However, this concept of issuing mortgage loans at "teaser" interest rates for an agreed initial period with higher interest rates later is not exclusive to the US. One Thai banker who I have known for years telephoned me for an objective view on a situation. She had a Swedish client who was working in Bangkok with a salary being paid in baht. He wanted mortgage finance of 3 million baht for the purchase of a condominium.

The client was under the impression that he could receive finance from a Swedish bank or, if the finance package was to be via a Thai bank, that a Swedish bank would be prepared to finance the transaction.

The Thai bank was prepared to advance a loan based on 4% interest for the first year followed by 7% in subsequent years. The Swedish bank was prepared to finance the loan at a fixed rate of 5%. If the transaction had been on a level playing field, that is both banks lending in baht, then the

Swedish offer would have been far superior.

However, it was unlikely that the Swedish bank would have been remotely interested in taking a mortgage on a Bangkok condominium. It would have required other security for the loan. Even assuming this was avail-





Foreigners in Thailand are starting to feel the pinch of inflation and the rising value of the baht. Many are dependent on remittances from their home countries to fund their lifestyles, which often include trips to high-end shopping malls and lavish restaurants.

As each repayment would involve foreign-exchange charges and bank charges from Thailand to Sweden because the salary was being earned in Thai

> baht, it became more efficient to simply have a Thai mortgage.

> However, if the loan had been for 30 million baht instead of 3 million baht, a different conclusion may have been recommended, but much more information would have been necessary.

Many foreigners in Thailand are dependent on remittances tinue their lifestyles in Thailand. Already, one can see from letters being published in the Thai press that American expats are feeling the pinch from a rising baht and falling US dollar.

Naturally, rich Americans are able to shrug this off, but many retirees are already unsure how they are going to fund their lifestyles and, more commonly, satisfy the Thai Immigration department's income/lump-sum requirement.

The strains on the baht to appreciate further are obvious. The currency is now running on two-tier pricing offshore and onshore and the difference between the two is around 10%.

Other Asian countries, including Singapore, Malaysia, India and China, are also feeling the

pressure. All of them have massive current-account surpluses with continually rising foreignexchange reserves. Naturally, this is creating pressure for increases in the value of their currencies. This is not just going to be against the US dollar, but many other currencies as well.

Any person retiring in Asia must include in their calculations a significant percentage of appreciation of the local currency against their home currency. In my opinion, people holding pounds sterling should anticipate an exchange rate of 50:1. This is not a new idea – it is a philosophy I have held for 10 years. Higher exchange rates to date are merely a bonus.

Another significant factor is inflation. We live in an era in which inflationary pressures are supposedly muted in most countries. A jaunt around the Internet or a quick glance at the statistics published weekly in the Economist will bear this out. Obviously, however, there are exceptions, such as Russia.

However, as Fund Manger Andy Brough of Schroders said as guest host on CNBC's Europe Today, "It is funny how everything the [British] government includes in its basket are the only things that don't seem to go up in price."

Although inflation is generally much lower than it was in the 1960s and 1970s, for the vast majority of countries it must still be taken into account.

Inflation is the loss of the buying power of money. Real pressures are being felt globally, especially in the areas of energy and food prices.

Note the vast increase in the cost of living in Phuket over the past decade and this is while Thailand is not suffering from high inflation rates. As with everywhere else in the world, it is the compounding effect of inflation year after year that does the damage.

Retirees are most at risk, especially if they have been too optimistic about the amount with which they can retire.

People are living longer and this means that on retirement, capital sums must be much larger.



A Roll of the Dice

very boxing event, no matter where it takes place or who the combatants are, is a hit or miss affair. Fighters are human, as are the organizers, thus you never really know what is going to transpire.

Sometimes match-ups that are hyped up to be fantastic are dreadfully boring, while a couple of unknown battlers leave an audience awestruck. Any number of variables can contribute to the unexpected — which is what keeps boxing fans coming back for more.

Some of the shows I've covered in Thailand left me questioning why I even shelled out the cab fare to get to them – the fights were garbage and a few of the visiting fighters weren't ready to set foot in a boxing ring, let alone in front of a crowd – however small.

In Thailand, the chances of a visiting fighter defeating a Thai are always the same, slim to none. That's how the promoters and matchmakers want it – minimal risk

In boxing circles it's called "legalized fight-fixing", and it happens all over the world; in small shows and big ones (Barerra – Fana). Supposedly, it's a necessary evil.

But legalized fight-fixing detracts from the roll of the dice, sort of like having an ultrasound done to find out whether your unborn child is a boy or a girl. Saying "It's a boy" after an ultrasound doesn't quite have the same snap to it as it does after a nine-month wait.

Yet, I always go to the fights – driven by some unseen force, I go – I must go. I don't want to miss a fight actually worth watching, for example when, by

some miracle, the visiting fighter beats the long odds and wins for once. I'm a boxing writer; I'm also a fan.

Lately, I've started rooting for the foreigner; just once I want to see some poor guy who's supposed to take a beating surprise everyone, including his own corner, and win.

One fight in particular remains indelibly etched in my mind; Fahpetchnoi Sor Chitpattana (Thailand) versus Lito Sisnorio (Philippines) for the WBC Youth Flyweight title. I had seen both fighters fight before and remembered Sisnorio as a sloppy fighter, but with a pretty good punch. Sor Chitpattana was the WBC's fifthranked flyweight, a decent fighter but still very green. Frankly, I didn't think he was deserving of his ranking as there were far better fighters in the division, but that's boxing. Sisnorio had lost his last two bouts and had not beaten a single fighter with a decent pedigree.

The fight showed every sign of being yet another easy win for the Thai until...wham, Sisnorio dropped Sor Chitpattana late in

the first round with a short right hand. The stunned crowd was silent until Sor Chitpattana pulled his crumpled carcass from the canvas and showed he was capable of continuing. Most at ringside believed it was a lucky punch. Note: There really is no such thing as a lucky punch—if a punch was thrown it was done so for a reason.

When round two begins it is clear that Sor Chitpattana is apprehensive of Sisnorio's power and has become tentative.

Crack – another big shot from Sisnorio and down goes Sor Chitpattana. He is up at the count of seven but eats punch after punch while pressed against the ropes. Somehow, he makes it to the end of the round and again, the Thai audience has hope. "Of course, it can't be true," they think to themselves. "It's not going to happen to our guy. We'll come back – we always do."

I on the other hand had my own thoughts...

"Just once! Just once the guy brought in to lose will win – and win big!"

Sisnorio shuffled away

from the Thai and looked over to his corner.

"What should I do?" he asked in Tagalog. "Should I knock him out?"

Immediately I felt my blood boiling and spider senses tingling. It couldn't be true. Surely, he wasn't paid to lose. Did he accidentally knock down Sor Chitpattana without really trying? The round ended and my questions remained unanswered until after the bout

In rounds three and four, Sor Chitpattana regained his senses, using his jab to put distance between Sisnorio and himself. He did what he was supposed to and stayed out of trouble. As the seconds ticked by, his confidence began to return.

"Damn," I thought. "This always happens. This Filipino is going to fade, and the Thai will win the late rounds to snatch the victory."

Just over halfway through round five, Sisnorio landed a crushing right hook that sent Sor Chitpattana into the canvas face first like he had been hit with a piledriver.

The referee didn't bother to count – the fight was over and the #5 fighter in the world (the WBC's world) was sent crashing unceremoniously into unconsciousness by a fighter boxing fans around the world have never heard of.

What was he asking his corner?

"Fahpetchnoi is my friend. I didn't know what I was supposed to do," he said.

Later I was told Sisnorio was inexperienced and had never won in Thailand. He was unsure if it was OK to knockout his opponent. Huh? Say again?

Sor Chitpattana would go 2-3 in his next five fights and is now ranked twenty-ninth; Sisnorio would die less than a year later from injuries suffered in the ring against former WBC flyweight champ Chatchai Sasakul.





PHUKET: After five day's of racing, Frank Pong's Jelik silenced all critics and claimed six wins of eight races to win the 21st King's Cup Regatta, fending off stiff opposition from Quantum Racing

Clear blue skies and 8 to 10 knots of northeasterly breeze greeted the sailors on day one of

Construction Update

RAWAI: Work on the 75-millionbaht The Club and Spa Village development on 1.5 rai in Soi Tristar, in Saiyuan, is 20% complete and the project is on schedule for completion by the end of next year.

Gardening by Bloomin' Bert

Keeping Phuket plants PC

hat is a minority group, anyway? I've never quite understood them. If it's just a group of people who are different from the rest, then I hereby suggest fat Yorkshiremen as the latest trend in minority groups. We could even apply to the EU for funding, demanding free beer tokens to maintain and uphold our minority status.

I once had a friend who was a dwarf. I think "dwarf" is actually a politically correct description; that's how he referred to himself. He didn't live in an enchanted house in the middle of the forest with a gorgeous nubile maiden, or have six friends who were equally lacking in stature or burst into song at the drop of a hat, with his mining pick perched on his shoulder.

No, he was just short. Very short. Steve was probably the tiniest person I've ever known, and what's more he was rather proud of his height. He was always first in the queue at the *Snow White* pantomime auditions (sincerely) so that he could indulge in the above activities. He was even involved in the British tradition of dwarf-tossing on a number of occasions.

He had no problem choosing the vocabulary to describe himself. He didn't call himself "vertically challenged" or "physically disabled", and certainly not "special" as he would have headbutted, full-on in the groin anybody who used that word to describe him. Steve really was that small and happy to call himself a dwarf.

So why does the rest of the politically correct world feel they must take it upon themselves to vanquish any word of this ilk from the English language? As this is after all a gardening column, I feel that it's important to call a spade a spade. That word has probably been banned, too.

At least spades are gardenrelated. But dwarfs? Well, there is the dwarf white bauhinia, or kaa-long in Thai. It's part of a much bigger group – the orchid tree family. The dwarf's most common relative elsewhere is probably the Hong Kong orchid tree, producing the flower used on the Hong Kong flag.

They are an incredibly striking group of trees, with flowers that leap out at you. Some of the colors are so vivid they're used to make natural dyes. With over 300 species in the group, from a distance some of them could be mistaken for orchids, but not this one – it doesn't show off the way its cousins do.

Unusually, the dwarf white bauhinia is originally from this part of the world, rather than another continent – its original home is just south of the border, in Malaysia. However, it's well suited to Thailand and has become wellestablished here. It's even been adopted as the provincial flower of Satun.

This is a perfect little tree for small gardens and places where you don't want other plants completely taking over. It will grow to only about two or three meters, and won't take up too much space.

This unassuming plant produces fairly small, white flowers that look like vaguely like snowflakes hanging on the branches. Sometimes it's called the snowy orchid tree, despite the fact that the flowers only have five petals compared with the snowflake having six. The leaves are easy to spot as they have a twin-lobed shape, resembling an ox-hoof.

The bauhinia acuminata, as those lovers of Latin call it, grows enthusiastically in full sun or partial shade.

The tree can grow in most types of moist, well-drained soils. Even sandy soils are fine, but give the plant plenty of water. With the right conditions, it will flower almost continually – it doesn't seem to tire of doing this.

The little tree will naturally

want. I prefer the natural look and to let it decide for itself what shape it wants to be. The branches will naturally droop a bit as the tree grows, so a little pruning to keep it strong is needed.

Pruning is often advised only after the blooms disappear, but as they never do here, it's difficult to know the ideal time. The best advice I can give is to prune after your second or third beer – not too many to affect your judgment, but enough to gather a little enthusiasm for the task.

Bear in mind that this tree is a dwarf, so it will never actually reach the dizzy heights of some of its taller relatives. Like many of its human counterparts, it's probably quite happy it's a dwarf. This one's a bit more difficult to toss, though.



THE WAR OF THE WAVES

try. Anyone who has been at home when one of those promotional pickup trucks has driven past proclaiming the latest furniture deals will know what I mean. The trucks advertising Thai boxing are even worse. "Tomorrow night! Tomorrow night!" Yes, we get it Thai boxing is on tomorrow night.

I'm normally a passive person, but I become infuriated when no matter where I go on the island, I come across noisy public disturbances.

There is no need for such a racket. Promotions don't have to be delivered at deafening volumes (whatever happened to leaflets?) and cars and bikes don't need to be driven at full revs. Every day I read about the problems of passive smoking, but I would like to put passive hearing on the table for discussion.

The list of noise nuisances around the island is endless. There are thundering motorcycles, intrusive building constructions, electric saws whirring and steel cutters clamping, trucks trundling along, concrete-mixing trucks booming down the roads, ice-cream vendors playing their tunes, fish vendors screaming for customers and karaoke bars with, well, lots of screaming customers.

Even in most hotel rooms you can't get a decent night's sleep because of noisy air-conditioning units. Noise is a serious health concern. Studies by the World Health Organization have

hailand is a loud coun shown that loud, ambient noises not only disrupt concentration levels, but can also lead to cardiovascular disorders, sleep disorders, migraines and an increased susceptibility to allergies.

I first realized how loud it is in Phuket when I was staying with friends in an idyllic German village near Ammersee. I woke up in the middle of the night, opened my eyes and thought I was dead - there was pure silence, the likes of which I hadn't experienced for years. There was no noise except the sensa-

tion of blood running through my veins and the sound of my heart beating.

It was shocking and it made me worry about how I have adapted to loud levels of noise. I did some research about reverse-wave noise elimination, also known as anti-noise. A sound wave can by physically neutralized when it overlaps with an identical

wave that has been rotated 180°.

I came up with a theoretical method of combating noise. My plan is to take a microphone and hang it outside my bedroom window, recording every pesky sound. The sounds would then be sent to a black-box recorder. I would turn the signal around 180° and send it to a set of speakers inside my bedroom. The result would be the elimination of one source of noise by another.

While this all sounds plausible, simple and ingenious in theory, in practice it is actually much more complicated. A single, low-frequency noise, such as a whistle tone, is not difficult to eliminate. The problem comes

with complex frequencies, such as music, conversation or general outside noise. Imagine trying to eliminate the ice-cream man's theme tune.

There are relatively few solutions commercially available.

Most solutions only defend people from abusive noise, rather than attacking the noise itself - ear muffs, for example.

The important factor in attacking the noise comes in deciding where to record the sounds and how far from the listener they should be recorded. Let's say I recorded

the noise outside of my bedroom from a static point. If I then move around, the noise will affect me in different ways – this is a prob-

Sound waves are reflected off of walls, furniture and even dust particles in the air. It is difficult to generate a perfect reverse wave when the frequency of the wave must be different at individual points in any given room. This is where we reach the limits of technology.

The first commercial solutions to noise disturbances were developed for helicopter and jet pilots. Pilots are fastened in their seats and surrounding noise can

therefore be eliminated by a reverse wave that allows a pilot to have normal conversations with people in a control tower.

In an acoustics lab at the University of Wuppertal in Germany, a circle of 24 microphones was arranged to record incoming sound, while

an electronic device simultaneously channeled reverse waves to 12 speakers and into the room, creating silence inside the circle.

Although this is too technical for most households, comfy chairs with integrated speakers and beds with head-end quiet zones are being developed.

Another interesting development is that of a special window that incorporates reversewave technology with microphones and speakers between two panes of double glazing.

The sound is measured and then eliminated by the windows. Although this technology has yet to be made commercially available, it could reduce sound levels by about 10 decibels.

Perhaps we are not so far from my black-box theory after all. I'm already a step ahead, however, in my idea for a black box that attaches to your belt.


At the touch of a button it could eliminate the sound of a barking dog, an annoying acquaintance or – better still – a nagging wife.


