# SorPorKor eviction ruling upheld by Supreme Court

PHUKET CITY: (Nation/Gazette): The Supreme Court on December 12 confirmed an appellate decision to evict members of the Tantiwit family from a 69rai plot designated for landless farmers in Kathu.

"The national-land-reform [SorPorKor] program is reserved for farmers.

"Non-farming individuals are not qualified to utilize landreform plots," the High Court said in its verdict, read out at the Phuket Provincial Court Build-

The Supreme Court ruling was the third against alleged land grabs by Phuket tycoons who were previously granted plots under the SorPorKor program, created to make state land available for use by poor, landless farmers.

When it was learned in 1995 that many wealthy Phuket families had been granted Sor-PorKor land rights, the resulting scandal later brought down the Democrat-led government of Prime Minister Chuan Leekpai.

Two other wealthy landowners who lost land-usage rights in Supreme Court decisions handed down this year include businessman Charearn Thavornwongwongse and Tossaporn Thepabutr, who is running for a Phuket parliamentary seat for the Democrat Party.

For the Tantiwit case, the prosecution petitioned the eviction of businessman Banlue Tantiwit on the grounds that he had wrongfully declared himself a farmer in order to put his name on the land reform program.

K. Banlue, former president of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (Or-BorJor), died of a heart attack in October 2001.

His heiress, Arunrat Sawatthong, inherited the plot and thus became defendant.

The defense argued that the original owner sold the rights for land use to the Tantiwit family in

After the land-reform law was enacted, the plot was within the area designated for redistribution.

The family then suspended its plan to petition for a land-right document and allowed the plot to be part of the land-reform program without contest.

K. Banlue applied for land use of his own plot by submitting his settlement on the land as evi-

Land-reform authorities had verified his farming credentials before granting him the right to settle on and use the plot.

But the high court said the key issue was whether the defendant was actually entitled to the land-reform program.

A source close to the Tantiwit family said they they did not wish to comment on the ruling to the media.

The family's business interests include the Patong Resort and Patong Tower in Kathu.

# launches road-safety campaign

PHUKET CITY: In its annual attempt to limit road carnage over the holiday period, the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM-Phuket) will once again organize a multiagency effort to promote safe driving during the "seven days of danger" period, from December 28 to January 3.

DDPM-Phuket Chief Chotenarin Kerdsom (who recently changed his first name from Aroon to Chotenarin) said in an official DDPM-Phuket press release that the annual migration of holidaymakers during the period inevitably leads to an increase in the amount of road accidents.

The province will establish a number of traffic police checkpoints in key areas. The exact locations of the checkpoints were not specified in the release.

Each of Phuket's three districts (Muang, Thalang, Kathu) will have "on average" three checkpoints and that these would be manned by about 10 officers.

As in previous years, the province has also been set with threshold numbers of accidents (41) injuries (32) and deaths (3) for the period. If actual numbers fall below these figures, the provincial effort will be deemed a success.

Phuket will be the only Thai province to utilize the power of stuffed toy animals to promote on road safety when 2,000 teddy bears will be distributed to motorists.

Named "Nong Prodpai" ("safe sister bear"), the bears will be given to motorists who demonstrate adherence to road-safety rules and regulations when passing though checkpoints.

# Woman dies in cliff-side tumble

THALANG (Kom Chad Luek, Gazette): Police have ruled as accidental the death of a 20-year-old woman who fell 20 meters down a seaside cliff near Nai Thon Beach on December 17 while she was on a motorcycle tour of the island with friends.

Lt Col Somkid Khaosang of Tah Chat Chai police station identified the deceased as Savittree Pinmuang, from Nong Bua Lumpu

K. Duangjai told police that when the four reached the top of a hilly section of road about one kilometer south of Nai Thon Beach, K. Savittree led the foursome walking through a forested area to the cliff, just north of the Trisara resort.

Eager to get near the sea, K. Savittree began to descend a rocky cliff but lost her footing and fell some 20 meters to an inaccessible ledge below.

After being notified by a local resident, police arrived to find all three of the victim's friends crying by the roadside.

K. Savittree's body was recovered and taken to Thalang Hospital after a 40-minute the Kusoldharm Foundation.

She suffered a massive head wound and broken left hand during the fall.

During questioning at the Tah Chat Chai Police headquarters, the victim's friends said they all lived and worked in Phuket.

That morning, they drank three bottles of beer together and set off north on a tour of the island with no particular destination in mind, hoping to find a quiet place where they could

"I questioned them and didn't hear anything that might indicate this could have been murder. They were all upset. All three gave the same version of events, so I expect this case was an accident," said Col Somkid.

# **Tsunami** memorial services

PHUKET-PHANG NGA: To mark the third anniversary of the Asian tsunami on December 26, a number of services will be held throughout the region.

In Patong, there will a meritmaking ceremony at Loma Park involving 108 Buddhist monks, along with speeches and a minute of silence in remembrance of the victims, from 10 am to 10:30 am.

Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit will lead the ceremonies.

In the evening, Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) is organizing a "Light Up Phuket" ceremony, where more than 100,000 candles will be lit along Patong's threekilometer stretch of sand.

Candles will be placed in the sand and lit between 5 pm and 7 pm while a standing vigil will

Students from Tessabaan Baan Samkong School will perform songs and help light cermonial candles that will be placed on the sand in Loma Park.

In Kamala, the Phuket Japanese Association will hold a memorial service from 10 am to noon at the Kamala Tsunami Memorial next to the Kamala Beach Hotel.

In Phang Nga province, there will be a number of services:

• At the Marine Ship Tor 813, Takuapa District, at 9 am, the Phang Nga OrBorJor is arranging speeches and flower offerings.

• At the Baan Namkem Tsunami Monument, Takuapa, from 8 am to 3 pm, there will be a multi-faith ceremony involving Buddhist, Christian and Islamic

· At Chong Fah Beach, Baan Bang Nieng, starting at 5 pm, HRH Princess Ubol Ratana Rajakanya will preside over a candle-lighting ceremony and the release of 5,395 lanterns in honor of the same number of people who died in the disaster.

# Land acquisition funds set for Chalong dam

CHALONG: Some 160 million baht for the final land acquisition for the Klong Krata reservoir project has been approved and landowners will receive compensation payments within two months

News that the funding had been made available under the Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives was reported during a project update meeting chaired by Phuket Vice-Governor Smith Palawatwichai at Phuket Provincial Hall December 13.

Irrigation Department officer Tawin Jairak, who oversees land acquisition projects from the regional Irrigation headquarters in Nakhon Sri Thammarat, told the Gazette that the Phuket Irrigation Office recently received about 160 million baht to fund the final compensation phase.

Part of the funding will be used to compensate landowners with title deeds to their land, who will receive 100% of the government-assessed rate.

The remainder will be used to compensate people who have valid land usage claims - but not title deeds. These people will be compensated at 90% of the gov-

ernment-assessed rate, which is based primarily on the distance of land plots to the nearest main road, Soi Luang Pusapha.

The 960-million-baht Klong Krata project will create a 5.7million-cubic-meter reservoir behind a dam 25 meters thick and 730m long.

Of the project budget, about 300 million baht has been earmarked for acquisition of about 430 rai along the base of the Nakkerd Hills.

Land owners and people with usage rights to the remaining plots have 60 days to appeal to the Ministry of Agriculture and Co-operatives if they feel the compensation they are due to receive is inadequate, K. Tawin said.

Currently, 11 parties with deeds or usage rights to a total of 30 plots are unsatisfied with the compensation offered, he added.

The Klong Krata reservoir is slated to be the island's third major water supply source.







# Strong turnout for absentee vote

PHUKET: Ahead of the general election this weekend, there was a strong voter turnout in advance polling held on December 15 and 16, with 25,956 voters from around the country making their way to Phuket Community Hall to cast absentee ballots in their home constituencies.

Phuket Election Commission (PEC) Director Supap Akkam told the *Gazette* that the turnout exceeded 85% of the 30,394 out-of-town voters who had registered to cast absentee ballots in Phuket.

The figures more than doubled the number casting absentee ballots during the last general election held in Phuket in 2005, he said.

Advance voting for Phuketregistered voters unable to go to the polls next Sunday took place at three polling stations, one in each district: the Kathu Army Petrol Depot in Kathu, the Thalang Pranangsang School in Thalang and Phuket Municipality Meeting Hall

A total of 6,546 voters, or 3% of all eligible voters, took the opportunity to cast ballots in advance. Most were in Muang District (4,717 voters), followed by Thalang (1,068) and Kathu (761).

There were no reports of spoiled ballots or illegal campaigning near polling stations while the



Almost 26,000 voters, many of them migrant workers from Isarn, turned up at Phuket Community Hall to cast absentee ballot last weekend more than double the number cast in the last general election held in 2005.

As for the charges of Election Act violations lodged with the PEC against some of the candidates by their rivals, these cases were being investigated by the Election Commission (EC), he

He was unable to say whether any of the investigations would be completed before voters go to the polls this weekend.

If the winning party is later found to have violated the Election Act, their victory will be annulled and by-elections called, he added.

As with the advance poll-

plies during the poll on December 23, when alcohol sales will be banned from 6 pm on December 22 until midnight the following day.

Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Col Paween Pongsirin told the Gazette that police will strictly enforce the ban, the purpose of which is to prevent drunken behavior that could disrupt polling or lead to violations of electoral law.

# Phuket convicts freed

PHUKET CITY: Phuket Provincial Prison on December 17 released 147 prisoners, 136 men and 11 women, at 9 am following a royal decree from HM King Bhumipol Adulyadej to mark his 80<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Also released from Baan Bang Jo detention center were two women and two men who had been detained there instead of paying fines.

The royal decree was issued on December 9 to give certain prisoners the chance to start a new life and re-enter society. The prisoners released included low-risk convicts who had one to two years left to serve, seriously ill prisoners, females imprisoned for the first time who had served not less than half their sentence as well as aging and handicapped prisoners.

Buddhist monks presided over the release ceremony, during which the ex-convicts pledged to lead crime-free lives from now

Of the roughly 1,100 prisoners detained in Phuket Provincial Prison, 46% are serving sentences for drug-related offenses, 22.6% for vandalism, theft and burglary, 12.5% for violence and 4.5% are sex offenders.

# Gambling tops crime statistics

PHUKET: Gambling topped the latest crime statistics released by Phuket Provincial Police, with 228 arrests in November.

Drug-related cases accounted for 109 arrests, of which 49 involved ya bah (methamphetamine) with a total of 3,170.5 pills seized.

Twenty-seven people were arrested for the use of cannabis, with 9.2 kilograms confiscated. There were 15 arrests for inhalant abuse and nine for possession of krathom (an indigenous Thai plant that acts as a mild stimulant) with 30kg seized along with an additional 200 leaves.

Eight people were arrested for possession of "krathom liquid" (a drink made from krathom leaves), and one person was arrested for possession of ya E (Ecstasy) with half a pill seized.

There were 110 cases of theft reported, three involving motorcycles, with arrests made in 68 of the cases.

There were seven reported attempted murders in November, with three cases "solved". Of 12 reports of assault, six arrests were made.

Eighty-one people were arrested for prostitution and 21 for possession of unlicensed firearms.

Two people were arrested in November for possession or distribution of pornography.













# Then and now:

ecember 26 marks the third anniversary of the Asian tsunami, which shook the lives of millions across the region. The statistics of the damage in Thailand (sourced from the UN Thailand) are staggering: 5,395 killed; 1,480 children orphaned; some 150,000 jobs lost in fisheries and tourism; 4,806 homes destroyed or badly damaged. Among the survivors are countless stories of loss, grief, despair, struggle and recovery.

Three years on, the *Phuket Gazette* revisits just a few of the many individuals who were affected by the disaster, to find out how they've rebuilt their lives since the waves hit.

### **Nasoot Boonsop** Koh Phi Phi Don.

A native of Phi Phi, K. Nasoot was running a speedboat business until the tsunami roared in. He lost his grandfather, aunt, nephews, nieces, and cousins more than 20 relatives in all, along with about 70 people from his village. He lost his home and, along with his relatives who operated small businesses such as gift shops and restaurants, lost his livelihood as both of his speedboats were smashed.

Right after the tsunami, K. Nasoot moved to the Krabi mainland to find work, but soon returned to Phi Phi.

With the help of government and private funding, he strove to rebuild his home and business. The government gave each person 2,000 baht in aid, while each homeowner was provided 30,000 baht.

K. Nasoot requested aid from the Department of Fisheries, and was granted, he says, about 40,000 to 50,000 baht. Each boat cost 1 million baht, so the remaining funding came from bank loans, he explains. He now has three boats.

K. Nasoot feels optimistic about the island's future. "Recovery has been fast here because there are many businesses, such as hotels and restaurants, and it's a tourist destination," he says, adding that the quick revival of many businesses had created a lot of job opportunities.

He has rebuilt his house, his business and says that although Phi Phi will never be the same, it

is still the place of his birth – his home. K. Nasoot says that his surviving friends and relatives have all helped him feel at home again, and recover from his losses.



### **Louise Arnold-Turner** Yanui Beach, Phuket.

Louise's loss in the wake of the tsunami does not appear on a list of statistics. Her home remained intact. She and her husband survived. Their security business not only survived, but did better in the aftermath due to an increased concern over security.

She counts herself lucky, and yet her life was changed forever due to the loss of her close friend and neighbor of some eight years, Leone Cosens.

Yanui, a narrow slip of beach between Laem Phromthep and Nai Harn, was hit hard by the tsunami. The son of Louise's landlord saw the water retreating, knew it was a bad sign and managed to warn most people in the area in time to get to safety.

Leone had gone into her rental house on the beach and missed the warning. Her body

was found inland later that day.

Louise was on her way back from Bangkok when she heard the news. At first she cried a lot. "I cried every day for a month. Losing Leone, seeing people at the airport searching for relatives. It was very stressful, very sad," she says.

Though tears still well up at the thought of Leone, Louise says that time has healed. "Being a bit of a Buddhist has helped," she says. "I believe everyone goes when it is their turn. It wasn't about God being nasty or anything it was just her time."

Continuing the dog charity work that she and Leone did together helps. "When you're helping someone else you don't feel so sorry for yourself," she says.

This month marked a milestone, of sorts, for Louise. For the first time in three years, she went down to Yanui Beach. Only a 100-meter walk from her home, but a long distance traveled in her recovery.





# five portraits of recovery

a long tradition of commuting between Phuket and Koh Racha Yai, where they own coconut plantations and run tourist-related businesses at the beach. She, her husband and three children were on Koh Racha the morning the tsunami struck. K. Thithiporn was at her home inland, but her son, 13 at the time, was in her beachfront clothing shop.

He saw the wave coming and scrambled to gather up items from the shop in the hopes of saving them. Quickly realizing he had no time, he dropped everything and ran back from the shore, escaping the wave as it rushed in.

In the blink of an eye, K. Thithiporn's 100,000-baht investment was swept away. She has not yet rebuilt the shop. "I got 10,000 baht [in government aid] but I had to use it to pay for my kids to go to school," she says.

While she was distressed at the loss of her shop, she says she feels lucky that it was the only loss. None of her kids or any of her relatives who live and work on the island were hurt or killed.

She and her husband have taken jobs in Phuket since the tsunami. "Now I am working as an apartment caretaker and my husband is working as a school janitor, so we have some money to support our family," she says.

"I hope next year I can go back to Koh Racha and set up the shop again."

K. Somsri was working as

a housekeeper at the Similana Resort on December 26 when suddenly many people began screaming and running. Not knowing what was happening, she ran after them, up the hill. The wave washed in and destroyed much of the resort, taking a number of resort workers and guests with it.

Safe on high ground, K. Somsri's thoughts went immediately to her son Nathapol, who was due to come visit her at work that morning.

K. Nathapol describes a harrowing journey. At a petrol station in Phuket, he had heard that something had happened in Patong but didn't think much of it.

As he reached the south end of Khao Lak, he saw bodies strewn among the resorts, then raced to try to reach his mother, further north.

The road to Pakweep was impassable, so K. Nathapol went to Bangsai Hospital in search of


his mother. On his motorbike, he searched the area for K. Somsri and finally, after three days, they were reunited.

K. Nathapol says that he lost 10 cousins and too many friends to count.

K. Somsri was without work for about five months while the resort was under repair, but survived with the help of many aid organizations during those lean months. She's now back working at the resort.

She says that she still thinks about the waves, but she has to make a living so she chooses to stay on at the resort. Others do not feel the same: "Many local village people and my neighbors moved away," she says. "For the village, the traditional boat-floating ceremony has not happened since, as they are still scared and remember that day. They sold their land and moved away.

"Many of my friends still have financial problems but they don't know where they can get help," she added.

Franky, the Khao Lak correspondent for the *Gazette*, was at his home on Bang Niang Beach when the tsunami struck. He recalls nearly drowning after being trapped in a nearby resort

bungalow and then swept about one kilometer inland. Both of his parents, who were with him in his home, died that day, along with his pets and many friends and neighbors. His home was destroyed.

He felt tremendous grief and anger in the initial aftermath. "The first three months were hard, searching for my parent's remains, emptying their flat in Germany and so on," says Franky. "Both my parents were identified in March and we gave them a proper burial at sea – closure – which was very helpful in recovering psychologically."

He found solace with his friend, a hypnotherapist, who helped Franky prepare emotionally for clearing out his parents' home back in Germany.

"I guess without his help I would have suffered more psychologically and would not have been able to deal with the tsunami issue that well."

Six months after the tsunami, Franky and his fiancée had a son, Martin, which he says was one of the happiest moments his life.

"From then onwards it was easy. I buried myself in work, which also helped, and helped my little family to survive the so-called aftermath."

Three years on, Franky says the disaster still affects him, but in a positive way. "I have made peace with the tsunami, the sea, Buddha, god and mother earth. I feel no anger regarding the tsunami and I feel sorry for the ones who are not able to let go and whose minds and thoughts still revolve around the tsunami. Life is too short to poison your soul with grief, anger and hatred."

And, he notes, he now lives 50 meters above sea level.



Last year, a series of bombs went off in the capital on New Year's Eve. No one was killed, but one injured foreign tourist had to have her legs amputated.

Prime Minister Surayud Chulanont has emphasized that relevant authorities must closely monitor the situation in tourist centers, including Bangkok. Chiang Mai, Pattaya, Phuket, Haad Yai and Koh Samui, and swiftly take action if any violent incidents arise.

K. Chaiya said intelligence reports indicated there will be movements and rallies that "may be incited toward violence".

Singer stoned. Police in Kamphaeng Phet have issued an arrest warrant for one of two men suspected of throwing a rock at cafe singer Saowapa "Nong Beer" Petchlek, fatally injuring her.

Under questioning before the warrant was issued, suspect Ekkachai Joykaew, 25, maintained his innocence.

According to a witness, the 20-year-old singer had spoken rudely to a person named "Ek", one of two men on a motorcycle that drove past the cafe early on December 13.

The two men returned and threw a 1.5-kilogram rock at Saowapa.

She died later in Kamphaeng Phet Hospital.

Online scammers. The Department of Special Investigation (DSI) is probing the origin of several websites accused of luring people into bogus investment schemes and defrauding them of their money.

Col Piyawat Kingket, head of the DSI Office of Special Criminal Cases, said his agency was still gathering evidence in order to arrest the people behind the schemes.

If the websites were operated from overseas, his office Technology and Information to help enforce the crackdown.

Meanwhile, the Office of Consumer Protection Board (OCPB) is planning to publish warnings about fraudulent investment schemes on its website, www.ocpb.go.th, following a boom of such scams recently.

"We will describe the suspicious schemes without identifying the company by name. This should help stop people from be-coming victims," said OCPB Sec-retary-General Rasamee Vistaveth on December 16.

Bait and switch. Two French tourists were robbed after they took two transvestites to their sage late on December 10.

Annisse Rannane, 23 and Delil Secen, 18, were found tied up and naked in their rented room in South Pattaya at 12:30 am.

They told police that they met the two transvestites while walking back to their room and the two offered sex and massage services.

But when they took the two transvestites back to their room, two Thai men with covered faces stormed into the room and robbed them, they said.

Simian savagery. A female monkey in Samut Sakhon's Krathum Baen district attacked and killed two-month-old Pongnarin Iamsam-ang, who was left lying unattended in his cradle on December 13.

Siriwat Paowongsa, head of the National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation Department's wildlife protection division said people had described the monkey as "rather fierce".

The monkey had been kept at the shop for years, but it went missing about a week before the attack.


The tiny victim sustained serious wounds to his head and died at Srivichai 3 Hospital the same day.

He was cremated the following day because his mother had no money to pay for a funeral service and already owed the hospital 50,000 baht in treatment costs.

The monkey's owner faces criminal and civil charges, police

**Drug arrest.** A Samui resident was arrested on charges of drug trafficking after police intercepted him with a large quantity of marijuana while traveling further south in Thailand.

Chumphon Phanompharai, 33, was stopped in Chumphon Province with 497 kilograms of marijuana worth a total of 6 million baht. K. Phanompharai told police he was delivering the drugs, which originated in Laos, to Phattalung province.

He confessed to police that he had been hired by a Laotian man to transfer the drugs for

100,000 baht. Although he admitted to the crime, he stated this was the first time he had been involved in any such activ-

Police on Samui believe the drugs were intended for distribution on Koh Samui and Koh Pha Ngan, where marijuana can command high prices, especially around the time of the major parties.

Police officials on Koh Samui and Koh Pha

Ngan have been ordered to with it for so long. It's hard to clamp down on drug activity this high season and during the upcoming elections.

Thieves caught on ferry. After months of reported thefts and break-ins all over Koh Samui, two suspects were apprehended while trying to flee the island.

Pol Mai Savan Satsree said the suspects were apprehended aboard a ferry arriving at Donsak from Samui. The suspects were carrying five laptop computers, four mobile phones, three wristwatches and other items worth about 10,000 baht.

Police announced the arrests after much pressure was put on authorities to hold someone accountable for the crimes, which were becoming daily occur-

"Cars and trucks right in front of the police station were broken into and nothing was being done to stop it," said Darren Carries, a resident of the Nathon area, where many of the reported car break-ins took place.

Teeraphat Kawwnamyen, 24, and Vinai Boobsook, 22, were arrested and accused of being involved in at least 22 thefts around the island, many of which are believed to have taken place in broad daylight.


Steven Barey, a victim of three house burglaries, said, "it gives [me] some confidence in the police efforts. It's horrible to think that these guys were getting away

# Police foil Khok Kloy assassination

n the latest in a series of attempts on the lives of Phang Nga politicians, three men were arrested on December 12 while allegedly on their way to assassinate a local politician and canvasser for the Democrat Party in Khok Kloy, just north of the Sarasin Bridge.

Police later arrested the man they believed to have ordered the attack.

The three men were stopped at 6:30 pm at the PTT gas station next to the Mitsubishi Phang Nga car showroom in Khok Kloy. Without license plates, the pickup the men were traveling in matched the description of a vehicle an informant had told police would be used in an assassination.

On searching the vehicle, officers found an M-16 assault rifle with 27 rounds of ammunition, a short-barrel shotgun with three cartridges and a fully-loaded .357 revolver.

Police also seized three mobile phones, three bundles of *krathom* leaves (an indigenous plant used as an illegal stimulant) and a pair of Krabi registration plates.

Police identified the trio as the pickup truck's owner Wichian "Moo" Chaisit, 32, from Surat Thani; Sujin 'Iat' Chuaysathit, 36, from Ayudhaya; and Suchat Reuangphan, 51, from Nakhon Sri Thammarat.

One of the policemen investigating the case said that all three men confessed that they had been hired by Pracha Ongaat, 56, to kill the president of a Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*) in the area. The intended target was also a canvasser for the Democrat Party.

The suspects claimed they had met Pracha earlier that day and he had given them the M-16 and the revolver. When they were arrested, the men were due to meet Pracha again to be taken to the target and collect 40,000 baht in payment, the police source said.





## **READY TO VOTE**

On hearing that the suspects were due to meet Pracha, police loaded the men back into their pickup and rushed back to the gas station. Shortly after police arrived at the gas station, Pracha and a female companion arrived. When Pracha stopped the Toyota Corolla he was driving, police swooped in and arrested the pair. Police found 40,000 baht in cash in the car.

Pracha and his companion, named by police as Natalie Ketsuwan, 40, were taken to Khok Kloy Police Station to be questioned. Both suspects denied any knowledge of an assassination plan and claimed they were simple farmers.

Officers at Khok Kloy Police Station were later joined by Phang Nga Provincial Police

Commander Maj Gen Pricha Samutpaoraya and Takua Thung District Chief Chonsit Thanasana, who assisted in interrogating the suspects.

The case drew interest from the public, with a crowd of about 100 people gathering outside the police station to await updates. Police said that they would make an announcement about the case in the coming days.

This alleged attempt on the life of a politician was the third high-profile politically motivated crime in Phang Nga this month. On December 7, a member of the Phang Nga Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) from Kuraburi district was shot dead.

On December 5, an unknown number of gunmen

opened fire with assault rifles and shotguns on the house of Phang Nga *OrBorJor* President Bamrung Piyanamwanit. No one was injured in the attack.

In 2004, two *OrBorJor* presidents were gunned down within six months.

**Getting gyped.** A man suffered severe burns to his legs while attempting to immolate himself in Surat Thani's Kanchanadit district on December 13.

Suriyan In-kaeow, 26, was protesting the transport of gypsum by dump truck from a nearby mine to the coast, which had destroyed the road running through his village and caused health problems for local residents forced to breath in large amounts of gypsum dust.

K. Suriyan was part of a 300-strong protest that blocked the Tha Tong Mai-Ban Kradae-jae road at 3 pm.

After he poured petrol over his body and set himself alight, fellow protesters rushed to extinguish the flames. He was taken to Surat Thani Hospital, where he was treated for severe burns to the legs.

K. Suriyan said that he had set himself on fire to draw the attention to the problem and to repay his debt to his family and society for previously being imprisoned for drug dealing.

Protesters said that more than 100 trucks a day, some weighing more than 30 tons, pass along the stretch of road the protesters had blocked.


As the road was made for vehicles of up to 18 tons, the surface had been badly damaged. Almost everyone living near the road suffered from allergies and breathing problems, the most seriously affected being children and the elderly, protesters said.

About a month before the demonstration, villagers submitted a petition signed by more than 5,000 people to the local District Office. No action had been taken, they said.

The villagers said that they would hold their next protest outside Surat Thani Provincial Hall to attract the attention of Surat Thani Governor Winai Buapradit, who previously served as a Phuket Vice-Governor.

Gov Winai said that he had yet to receive a detailed brief on the problem, but would consult with Kanchanadit district officials on how it could best be solved.

# Phi Phi reefs get a transplant

As part of the celebrations to mark the 80th birthday of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej, the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC) on December 3 brought diving volunteers and students to the Phi Islands to stage a beach and underwater cleanup and also to transplant fledgling corals to nearby reefs.

PMBC Director Wannakiat Tubtimsang explained that the Phi Phi Islands were chosen for the project because the clear waters and coral reefs around the islands are popular with tourists. According to a survey by the PMBC after the tsunami, about 10% of the nearby corals were destroyed by the devastating waves.

"The coral reefs at Koh Phi Phi Lei were among the worst hit by tsunami in 2004," said Dr Nalinee Thongtham, who heads the PMBC's coral reef rehabili-

This was not the first time the PMBC had planted corals in an area devastated by the tsunami. In October last year, the center transplanted 1,200 fragments of coral at Koh Phi Phi Lei, again with help from local diving companies as well as volunteer divers from Bangkok and elsewhere.

"We grew tiny coral fragments in floating nurseries and now they are big enough to grow by themselves. Volunteer divers from local diving companies helped us transplant them," explained Dr Nalinee.

"The advantage of growing coral fragments in nurseries and transplanting them on natural substrate is that you don't have a lot of foreign matter on the sea floor. In addition, taking small fragments has little effect on the donor colonies," she added.

"Growing coral fragments in

floating nurseries is part of a research program we started two years ago. Transplanted corals are now thriving well. The activities at Koh Phi Phi Lei and Koh Phi Phi Don that we did on December 3 is one way to get the public involved in coral conservation and increase environmental awareness," she said.

"The PMBC will also transplant corals grown in nurseries at Panwa Bay at a later date. It will be a pioneer project using a coral species that can better tolerate turbid waters and sediments," Dr Nalinee added.

Konee Kongkhamliab of the Ao Nang Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*), which is responsible for the Phi Phi Islands, told the Gazette that he felt proud that the PMBC and volunteers chose to help preserve the marine environment surrounding the Phi Phi Islands.

"Our underwater cleanups

are usually done through the local dive community, who are good in that they ask their customers to be careful and help preserve the coral reefs," he said.

K. Konee added that the coral reefs there have suffered very little damage by humans and that nearly all the damage to them was caused by the tsunami.

"We have about 5,000 tourists per day in the high season and we constantly let tourists know that they are not allowed to take any coral home as a souvenir," he said.

Dr Nalinee explained that so far about 80% of the transplanted coral has survived. "We check every two months for up to a year after the coral has been transplanted," she said.

She added that it takes about 10 months for the fledgling corals to grow strong enough to survive the transplant. "This type of coral can live in unclear water. If it is successful here, we will use


it to help recoveries in places with damaged coral, such as off Koh Raht [the island that is being promoted as Jumeriah Private Island Resort] and in front of the PMBC [at Cape Panwa]," she said.

The concept of using coral nurseries and transplanting coral came from Israel through a technology and expertise exchange program involving organizations in six countries and EU funding.

"The technique is from Israeli research. We have just adjusted their nursery technique to suit our environment," Dr Nalinee explained. "Each stick of coral costs 512 baht to grow and transplant. So far, we have planted 1,200 coral sticks at Phi Phi," she

"Next year, we might expand the project to reefs off Koh Phi Phi Don, but as many tourists and many boats go there, we will have to check whether it is worthwhile saving the coral there," she said.



arang Food Paradise purveys wholesale of various imported or unusual food supplies – duck meat, diabetic jams, Teisseire fruit syrup, raw chocolate, duck and goose liver, gizzards, pigeon, quail, Guinea fowl, pheasant, rabbit, calf sweetbreads, crocodile meat, Beluga caviar, sheep kidney, haunches of wild boar, frog legs... the list goes on, with products from 15 countries. Next came a course one diner guessed was a culinary riddle: Steamed Mud Crab Claw in Creamy Lemon Grass soup. A partner in the press compared it with clam chowder and expressed content that "the lemongrass was not over done."

Key to the riddle was the accompanying Terra Mater Paso Del Sol Cabernet Rose, "To show transition between reds and whites," said an astute gourmand. It was a fine choice, for the tasty soup was likewise neither light nor dark.

Then came the Champagne Peach sorbet. Normally just a palate cleanser, the sorbet was transformed into a show-stopper by its presentation: spouts of charcoal gray teapots billowed steam from dry ice placed inside their bellies; the teapots' inverted lids served as bowls for the

Everyone was delightfully

floored. Veteran Belgian airline pilot Pierre Van Impe, who has started the ironically named Icarus restaurant in Phuket City, was impelled to favorably compare Chef Dion's cuisine with that of Tour d'Argent and other Guide Michelin three-star restaurants.

The chef later revealed his sorbet idea was pioneered at one of the Grand Hyatt hotels.

Fifth course was New Zealand Scallops with Prawn Stuffing. Light red coconut sauce and crispy ginger enhanced the flavors, and La Chasse du Pape prepared the way for course six: Seared Monkfish and Chorizo-Tomato sauce. This was perfect, with the chorizo appealingly savory.

Now we come to the meat. Servers first poured 2004 "old vines" Moulin De Gassac Cabernet-Syrah-Mourvedre; others brought plates of enticing Pepper Encrusted Duck Breast on Glazed Pineapple.

The wine was deep ruby in color, with fat legs like a Rubens nymph and a come-hither nose of raspberry and herbs, but perhaps too structured on the tongue.

I'm a great fan of black pepper and duck, so, needless to say, the dish was satisfying.

Finally we arrive at the main course, Venison, the meat of kings, served blood rare in 3/4inch smoked medallions with Mushroom Risotto and Truffle Jus. The last-named was a sort of barbecue sauce. Tasty - no wonder kings like it. For dessert, we had Dion's Warm-Centered Chocolate Pudding and sparkling Prosecco Spumante.

To sum up, the dinner was wonderful and all returned home well-sated. I venture to add that it raised the bar for chefs who want to walk the walk and talk the talk of haute cuisine on Phuket.

# Phuket Christmas panto? Rawai not!

ecember 26 will be a day of family fun and frolics at the Green Man Pub in Rawai. Amateur dramatic group the Rawai Players follows English tradition by staging a Christmas pantomime production of *Mother Goose*. **Fiona Stalker** reports.

other Goose is a tale of love and friendship, good and evil, demons, fairies and a golden-egg-laying goose, with a strong moral undercurrent flowing through the tongue-incheek dialog and staged antics.

Parents and adult audience members will be kept entertained with the odd bit of innuendo and references to the hassle of 30-year leases in the village property market, but the day belongs to the children who will be seated close to the stage where they form the chorus.

The kids are encouraged to boo the baddies, cheer the goodies and warn the characters whenever ghouls, ghosts or goblins appear by yelling the famous panto line "Look out! It's behind you!"

This year the chorus has the added responsibility of looking after the character Charlie Goose's "magic plant" and will be rewarded with sweets for alerting him should any villagers wander too close.

Pantomimes have a long history of physical comedy and silly costumes, with roots in the

Italian Middle Age theater of commedia dell'arte and links to early European festivals such as Saturnalia and Twelfth Night, when the natural order was meant to reverse meaning – the

leading panto lady has always been played by a man in drag.

The outrageous art form was further popu-

larized in England during the early 1800s by the famous English clown Grimaldi, whose first big panto break also came with *Mother Goose* in 1806.

It is in these oversize footsteps that the Rawai Players follow, headed by English expatriate Tony Kelsey-Stead.

Kelsey-Stead took early retirement from teaching and moved to Phuket 12 months ago, but missed his previous involvement in amateur dramatics and approached Howard Digby-Johns at the Green Man English Country Pub in Rawai.

"I had the idea for the Rawai Players, saw Howard and that was it. Bang done!" Kelsey-Stead said.

Kelsey-Stead recruited friends and Green Man patrons and adopted an all-welcome attitude and the drama group began to meet at the Tudor-style pub every Thursday at 7 pm to rehearse the first production: *Mother Goose*.

"I'm so happy that it got off the ground with the backing of Howard and the Green Man," Kelsey-Stead said.

"Every rehearsal I've been absolutely gob-smacked at the talent we have," he added.

Magazine editor Molly McGill was one of the expats who jumped at the chance to dust











off her acting skills but, hailing from Vermont, was at first unfamiliar with the strange entity that is a Christmas panto.

"When I first heard the word pantomime I thought, 'What's that?' and had visions of us with white faces miming," said McGill, who plays the part of Charlie Goose's girlfriend Jill.

"I was glad to hear it's a children's Christmas play because kids are a great audience. They're always honest and ready to giggle," she added.

The Players even have their own giggle-tester in the form of panto director Simon J Hand's five-year-old daughter who has attended rehearsals and confirmed that characters falling off chairs, singing and doing Irish jigs is funny to even the younger end of the age spectrum.

Englishman, long-time Phuket resident and father of two, Hand is relishing his directorial role and also the opportunity to bring something new to the island.

"It's nice to have something

more culturally significant than the Rawai Seashell Museum," Hand said, conceding that a panto might still be low on the culture scale but indicating forthcoming short-comedy evenings and other dramatic adventures.

So enthralled have the Rawai Players become with their panto antics that they send group emails written in rhyming couplets, championed by the Demon of Discontent, played by Russell D. Russell, who penned the following for readers of the Phuket Gazette:

Mother Goose is fabulous, and looks great in her dress. Whilst both Charlie and Jill can't fail to impress.

The squire is simply awesome, and the Fairy is in the know, But we all know that the Demon, is the star of the show!

Altogether now: Boooooo!



# Great News from Lake Woebegone

arrison Keillor is an American institution. He has been running the greatest radio show in America, A Prairie Home Companion, out of St Paul, Minnesota, since 1969, expanding it over the years into a variety show with music, comic skits and phony commercials: "Powdermilk Biscuits: the biscuits that give a shy person the strength to get up and do what needs to be done" and "Ralph's Pretty Good Grocery. If you can't find it at Ralph's, you can probably get along without it.'

Fittingly, director Robert Altman's last movie was a eulogy to A Prairie Home Companion, written by and starring Garrison Keillor.

The highlight of the show is Keillor's monologue, News from Lake Woebegone, which is about a small town in Minnesota, much like his own childhood hometown. His tagline on Lake Woebegone is: "Where all the women are strong, all the men are good-looking and all the children are above

These monologues and stories originally printed in The New Yorker came together in his first book Lake Woebegone Days in 1985.

His current novel, Pontoon: A Novel of Lake Wobegon (Viking Adult, 2007, pp256) is the sixth in a series about the modern-day inhabitants of Lake Woebegone.



Keillor's writing style is loose, colloquial and empathetic. He is fond of long, humorous tangents that build up energy through gloriously giddy run-on sentences. He is also adept at quirky characters like most of those who inhabit Pontoon.

The story opens in the present day with the death of 82-year-old Evelyn Peterson: "Evelyn was an insomniac so when they say she died in her sleep, you have to question that.

Probably she was sitting propped up in bed reading and heard the brush of wings and smelled the cold clean air and an angel appeared like a deer in her bedroom...

She had three children: Bennett in penury in New York, Roger in luxury in California and Barbara languishing still in Lake Woebegone, an alcoholic divorcee with a 400-pound boyfriend named Oliver.

Evelyn was a formidable figure, especially in the last years of her life after the death of her husband Jack, whom she consigned to exile in a lakeside cabin.

"Actually she looked great right up

to the day she died, a Friday night in July," Keillor writes. "She had a long neck and a prominent nose and high cheekbones; after she kicked Uncle Jack out she looked even better, happier, looser, janglier, jaunty.

"She was tall and wiry and stayed limber by hiking everywhere and doing her Daily Dozen. She was an outspoken aunt in a family of murmurers."

Her body is discovered by her daughter Barbara who also learns through letters and phone messages that her mother

has long been carrying out an affair with TV kiddie show star Raoul Olsen in St Paul, whom she had met in the early days of World War II and has since embarked on a giddy secret spree of dancing in Daytona Beach and gambling in Reno.

Her after-death stipulations: no funeral, just her ashes packed in a bowling ball and dropped into the lake. Her nephew

Kyle volunteers to do this while flying over the lake on his parasail. The other big event in Lake Woebegone is the return from California of bad girl Debbie Detmer, now rich from pioneering the field of aromatherapy for cats and dogs.

She has come home for a "commitment ceremony" (nothing as old fashioned as a wedding) with her fiance? Brett to be performed by her minister Misty Naylor of the Sisterhood of the Holy Spirit on a pontoon on the lake, featuring a hot-air balloon, a fleet of 18-foot, pedal-powered duck decoys and a parachuting Elvis Presley impersonator. You can see how this might generate plot complications.

There's also a bus load of 24 Danish Luther-

an pastors exiled to America by an embarrassed bishop for doubting the divinity of Jesus Christ.

# BE CAREFUL WHO YOU CARBON COPY

B. At one point, Mr .A sent an abusive email to Mr B with some remark alleging a disparaging reason for Mr B's marriage to the daughter of his employer.

At the end of the message, he used the words "f\*ck you", which was interpreted by the receiver of the message as a serious defamation.

Mr A not only sent the email to Mr B but also sent a "CC" of the email to a third party, Mr C.

Tr A is involved in a law allowed the email to be used civil dispute with Mr to file a defamation charge against Mr A. The case has been accepted by the courts.

> As the email had been written in English, a translation in Thai has been provided, along with a translation and explanation of "f\*ck you".

> The third party, Mr C, has had to appear in court to certify his understanding of the words used and to explain his understanding of the email.

The charges in this case have been put forward under Mr B discovered that the Section 326 of the Criminal Code, which states (sic):

Whoever imputes anything to the other person before a third person in a manner likely to impair the reputation of such other person or to expose such other person to hatred or contempt is said to commit defamation, and shall be punished with imprisonment not exceeding one year or fine not exceeding 20,000 baht, or both.

Section 328 states (sic):

If the offense of defamation be committed by means of publication of a document, drawing, painting, cinematographfilm, picture or letters made visible by any means, gramophone record or any other recording instruments, recording picture or letters, or by broadcasting or spreading picture, or by propagation by any other means, the offender shall be punished with imprisonment not exceeding two years and fine not exceeding 200,000 baht.

The outcome of the case is still pending a decision by the Appeals Court.

One should be careful about the language used in email, especially when sending a CC to other people.

# Election dry spells leave tourists no choice

One of the hottest topics among Phuket's expat community in recent weeks has been the ban on alcohol sales before, during and immediately after voting in elections.

While a ban on alcohol sales around election time is nothing new in Thailand, most of the grumbling stems from the extension of the ban under the new Election Act to include the two-day advance voting period.

By the time balloting in this general election is over, five nights of nightlife trade will have been lost in a single month in the middle of the peak season.

Hardest hit are bar operators, who need to make hay while the sun shines – especially in Phuket, where many businesspeople consider simply breaking even during the low season a success.

Others forced to suffer unnecessarily are the foreign tourists who arrive in Phuket excited about the prospect of experiencing the island's world-famous nightlife, only to find the streets dark and their only option to wet their thirst are hotel room minibars and mom-and-pop stores, who are the only real winners during the ban.

Given that the extended alcohol ban is just another step by authorities to attempt to modify the behavior of citizens through excessive regulation, it is unsurprising that an Abac poll found that more than 60% of voters were undecided about who they would vote for just a few weeks before the election

Also, while turnout in Phuket with its legions of migrant workers was strong for the advance voting, there was no evidence that the alcohol ban was any more responsible for it than the nice weather.

In few places is the futility of the alcohol ban clearer than Patong, with fewer than 10,000 registered voters but 12,129 registered hotel rooms.

A sobering thought is that if any of the complaints against candidates filed with the Phuket Election Commission are held valid, then tourists will have suffer even more dry spells.

Another disheartening aspect of the current electoral activity is that none of Phuket's candidates seem to grasp the concept that the primary role of a parliamentarian is to legislate – not to fix roads, deal personally with local waste disposal issues or go on taxpayer-funded junkets abroad under the guise of tourism promotion.

A good place for those elected to represent the people of Phuket to start would be to overturn or amend parts of the Election Act that hurt the local economy, such as by exempting nightlife areas popular with foreign tourists from the alcohol sales ban.

# Keeping tabs on Buddha images

We still have the Buddha images, such as statues and figurines, that Phuket Airport Customs donated to us, but we have not put them on display at the museum because most of them are just rep-

However, there was one stone image of the Buddha's head that has been confirmed by the Fine Arts Department in Bangkok as being about 1,000 years old. This artifact will go on display in the museum at a later date.

All of the Buddha images that Customs gave us are objects of art and the Customs seized them under the Act on Ancient Monuments, Antiques, Objects of Art and National Museums B.E. 2504 (1961).

Although this law generally stipulates that any sacred objects from the Ayudhaya period or older cannot be taken out of country, it is used specifically to prohibit any complete Buddha image, or even a part of a Buddha image, such as just a hand or the head, from being taken out of Thailand.

However, replica images, not original artifacts, can be taken out of the country. These must be complete images of the Buddha, not just a part, and the person taking them out of the country must first obtain written permission from the Fine Arts De-

ustoms officials at Phuket International Airport last month donated to the Thalang National Museum 93 Buddha images seized from departing tourists over the past year, including one 1,000-year-old stone image of the Buddha's head.

However, nearly all the other items would have been allowed to be taken home by the tourists - if the tourists were given the correct permit to do so.

Here, Atjima Nookong, chief of Thalang National Museum and chief of the Phuket Provincial Fine Arts Department, calls for shops to apply for permits allowing their customers, namely tourists, to take Buddha images out of the country – long before the tourists even walk into their shops.

Even with the appropriate permits, however, no more than five complete replica images can be taken out of the country by any one person at one time.

In Phuket, the Fine Arts Department office is at Thalang National Museum. If there is no Fine Arts Department office in the province, permits can be obtained from the local provincial Cultural Office.

It is much easier, however, for tourists to simply ask the shop owners selling the images to obtain the permits for them.

A permit must be issued for each and every image, which means that local Fine Arts Department officers must inspect and approve each item. Also, the permit must be approved by the Governor or an officer on his behalf. All this usually takes only one

The law also stipulates that vendors must have a permit to sell Buddha images. This is where we can use the law to help vendors sell Buddha images so that tourists can legally take them home with them.

These permits are renewed annually and expire every December 31

In issuing these permits to sell Buddha images, Fine Arts Department officers must inspect the shop. When doing this, we always remind the shop owners that only complete replicas of the Buddha's image can be taken out of the country.

We explain to them that it is best to tell the tourists that if they do not have the proper permit, Customs will seize the image at the airport. We say that it is better to explain this to the tourists than the tourists being angry at the shop owner for not telling them, and when the tourists get home, they tell all their friends about their bad experience - and this, in its own way, can have an adverse effect on tourism here.

With each shop in the big hotels and each new shop opening in Phuket, we explain that they must first register their shop with us and register with us what Buddha images they have to sell.

Then, because we have inspected the shop and the artifacts already, we can issue permits for the items to be taken out of the country even before they are bought by tourists. That way the tourists can buy the image and receive the permit immediately.

I would like all shops selling Buddha images to do this, because it ensures that tourists can buy images that they are allowed to take home with them.

I also urge all tourists to check with the shop owner whether the item they want to buy can be taken out of Thailand. If the shop owner is not sure, then check with us.


Watch for her left-hand uppercut into hubby's exposed midribs to send the entire catastrophe hurtling into your nearside chromium.





## he future of PCs seems tainment centers, as well as the way we buy and store our music and videos.

The ideal cheap gadget for improving the sound on your PC, or even your portable radio or CD player, is the Cmoy headphone amplifier, named after the inventive, inspired gadget guy Chu Moy.

The Cmoy is particularly useful for people with hearing problems, weak speakers, tiny cheapo headphones, MP3 players or music and games that they

want to listen to at loud volume. Even high-end **UUT OF** PCs with great speakers might get a surprising jump in sound quality. Almost

everyone can benefit from it, yet few people have ever heard of the humble Cmoy.

Today's computers rival the best TVs in picture quality, but the audio is still not quite as good as a middle-range-quality stereo. Part of the problem is the weak hardware typically used to amplify PC sounds.

The power and signal being delivered to your speakers is often squashed and distorted by hardware that isn't up to the task. The amplifier in your PC is almost certainly underpowered. Most laptops and portable music players rob their amplifiers and speakers of power to conserve battery life.

Even on a really good PC, when you use software on the screen to turn up the volume, the software may be making promises that your hardware can't handle.

Software and hardware are like a choreographer and ballerinas in a room with a low ceiling. The choreographer can ask for three-meter-high leaps and pirouettes, but the ballerinas are

smacking into that ceiling every time they jump. What you get is low-volume thumping noises, headaches, grumbling and something that isn't quite "art".

The size of a sound wave is its volume. The shape of the wave

is what makes a cat sound differ-THE ent from a car horn. A good amplifier simply increases the height of the wave without

distorting the shape.

A bad or underpowered amplifier is like that low ceiling: when those ballet dancers start smacking the ceiling, the shape of their flight pattern is radically altered. A picture of their motion wouldn't look like the original waves. Instead, it would look like a mountain range with the peaks cut off flat, halfway up from the valley

When this happens to sound, you get a medium-loud square wave. Whether you're listening to a CD of opera, or kittens or a roaring soccer stadium, what you hear is a medium-loud, unrecognizable car horn kick-boxing with an angry kazoo.

Chu Moy, a clever guy with a soldering iron and an offended ear, came up with a simple gimmick to fix the underpowered amplifier problem. In essence, he said, "Hey, we're talking about only a few volts and a little amplification. I could put a fingernail-sized amplifier chip in a box with a volume knob and a battery and put it on the wire between the PC and speakers. I'd

get sweet, loud sounds without distortion.'

He slapped one together, plugged one end into his PC and the other end into his headphones and made history, beautiful music and magic. He posted the plans on the Internet and next, everybody was making and selling these little gadgets as kits, parts and completed boxes.

For 400 to 1,100 baht, everyone's bargain-basement PCs and cheap, little speakers were producing big, beautiful sounds. People with a Tweety Bird budget were making sounds to rival Pavarotti.

Want one? Search Google

or eBay for "Cmoy". There are free circuit diagrams, 400-baht kits, 700-baht completed circuits without the fancy box or 1,100baht ready-to-go boxes. If you're handy with electronics, find parts in Phuket City and the basement of Big C for 400 baht.

Maybe you're not proficient with a soldering iron, but you still want the fun of making something yourself, here are a few ideas:

If you're feeling artistic, you can buy the circuit already assembled and put a handmade case around it. Someone reasonably handy with a pocket knife and a bottle of glue can have real fun sticking these Cmoys into unexpected housings.

Here in Phuket, my friends and I have put Cmoys into TV remote controls, cellphone cases, candy boxes and plastic toys. One Phuket scamp even put his Cmoy into an empty box of... ummm... "Patong galoshes".






# Honda showroom ready for business

WICHIT: Honda dealer Anuphas Vividhkarn Co Ltd will open its 370-million-baht showroom and service center on Chao Fa West Rd on December 24.

Claimed to be the biggest Honda showroom service center in Southern Thailand, the center occupies 14 rai of the 1,630 rai that is slated to become the Anuphas and Son's Chao Fa City development.

Anuphas Vividhkarn managing director Montree Hongsyok said that of the 14,500 square meters of the new center's usable area, the service workshop with 54 service bays will occupy 3,500 square meters, the spare parts warehouse will occupy 350sqm and there will be parking space for 195 cars.

The showroom, which has been under construction for the past 18 months, will have space to display 10 cars at a time and the service center will be capable of servicing up to 150 cars a day, he added.

The new center is to soak up the trade from the original

Anuphas Vividhkarn Honda dealership on Phang Nga Rd, in Phuket City, established 19 years ago under the management of K. Montree. The service center section will close for renovation from

April next year.

K. Montree explained that although the Phang Nga Rd service center will close, the showroom will remain open.

The Phang Nga Rd show-room was the most successful Honda dealer in the country in 2004, selling 2,006 Honda cars that year.

K. Montree said that because of rising fuel prices, a slow-

down in the economy and the unstable political situations, the company will miss its sales target of 1,600 Honda cars this year. So far this year 1,280 Honda cars have been sold in Phuket.

However, he expects Honda sales to improve by about 9% next year, he added.

"Our service center on Phang Nga Rd is actually overcrowded," K. Montree explained. "We can service 50 cars per day, but after the new show-room opens we expect to service 200 cars per day through both centers," he said.

The Phang Nga Rd service center is scheduled to resume full services from the beginning of 2009.

K. Montree added that expansion plans for the site of the new showroom include developing a total of about 50 rai, including the Honda showroom, into an automotive services center.

The center will include Mazda and Ford showrooms and service centers occupying about eight rai each, and 20 rai has been set aside for other automotive businesses, such as sound system dealers, automotive accessory stores and secondhand car services.

Auphas Vividhkarn also opened a dealership in Khok Kloy on February 27.

The Honda showroom opening ceremony will be on December 24, coinciding with the launch of the new Honda Accord.

## nvestors are frequently baffled by the ever-increasing range of choices available. The following are some of the categories of investment products:

Money market funds. These are investments in cash or shortterm money market securities. The advantage for investors is that – because of the large amounts invested in the funds they can get wholesale investment rates that would normally not be available to the average investor. There are large numbers of these "funds" available in a wide variety of currencies.

Banks usually offer two types of money market funds: up to six months and between six months and 18 months. Most of these investments are on a daily call, that is, they can be withdrawn without notice and interest accrues on a daily basis.

Bond funds. These come in many shapes and sizes and in total cover trillions of dollars, euros and other currencies. Bond funds are often more complicated products than they first appear.

Funds may invest solely in one currency for their bonds or invest in a wide range of currencies. Every fund has a "base" currency but may use the issues of other currencies to enhance

returns. Currencyhedging techniques may or may not be used. Investors should examine the investment strategy in advance.

High-yield bonds. In general, this means that the manager of the fund is prepared to invest in bonds of a lowergrade investment

rating or even in

grade to enhance returns.

One recent case involved a very large investment group, GE, which offered short-dated bonds to investors, giving them the same feeling of safety as would be expected in a money market fund.

Unfortunately, the fund included some structured investment vehicles (SIVs). Investors received only 96% of their capital back. Fortunately, no members of the public were involved there were 14 institutional investors affected. The fund was

It was a very unusual case. GE is one of the largest corporations in the world. The losses, as the fund was not large, amounted to only US\$10-15 million. For the sake of their reputation, perhaps it would have been wiser for them to have taken the loss on their own balance sheet.

**Asset-backed lending.** This is an area where investors have to be careful. What are the quality of assets? That is the primary question.

In an era where securities have been listed as "double A" or even "triple A" by credit-rating agencies only to be downgraded to sub-investment grade/ speculative investment grade or "junk" within months must leave investors, including sophisticated institutional investors, wary of credit-rating announcements.

Simply, the global credit-rating agencies have been caught

> completely off guard over the past six months by a wave of SIVs, CDOs (collateralized debt obligations) and other complex "paper".

> Credit-rating agencies are claiming that ultimate responsibility for assessment lies with the investor. However, considering the high credit rat-

bonds that are not of investment ings given to some poor-quality investments recently, it can be only a matter of time before many cases end up in court, especially

> Credit-rating agencies have taken a serious blow to their credibility, and it will take them years to recover.

> For example, it was standard operating practice for Swiss banks to offer their clients a selection of bonds with the credit rating included as basic information. Now they include opinions of other broking houses and en

sure they are dealing with "pure" bonds, and not some opaque in-

Many other global banks have found themselves in the same situation.

Structured products. Many strange products have been

foisted onto an unsuspecting public by the private banking operations of many of the world's banks. These are often the private banking operations that advertise in the most exclusive

magazines and financial publications together with six-figure watches, eight-figure properties and the finest products and services for the ultra-rich.

Often, these private banking operations hint that they really do not serve clients with less than US\$10 million. Not for the "riff raff".

Some of the products they sell are firmly of the "heads we win, tails you lose" variety. Just as there are screams from "sub prime" borrowers in the US housing market that they did not understand the contract, the rich

victims of private banking operations also did not understand the nature of their investments. However, they are generally too embarrassed to discuss these matters.

The simple remedy is: if you do not understand a financial product, leave it alone. You will not be alone in your decision – many high-flying or crashing investment bankers have learned that if a financial product is not absolutely clear it is to be avoided.

The new term in global financial circles is "transparency". It is only common sense. However, how many millions of investors keep on forgetting that?

We only have to look back to 1999 when Warren Buffett, the world's wealthiest investor, said that he did not understand the business model of many dot.com startups or their valuations.

Michael Bloomberg, the founder of Bloomberg, also stated in an interview in the late 1990s that many dot.coms did not have a viable business plan and had never even shown a profit. How many people were listening

## Oleydong grounds Eagle By Scott Mallon merchai drew a huge crowd to the makeshift outdoor arena, with

hen WBC mini mum-weight belt holder Eagle Kyowa (18-2, 6 KOs) decided to return to his native Thailand after seven years of fighting in Japan, it was intended to be a homecoming party. Instead, he found himself traveling back to Japan sans belt, now questioning whether he'll be able to recapture the title he held for more than two years.

The past year in Thailand has seen an increasing number of promotions involving Thai-versus-Thai main events: Napapol Kittisakchokchai V Saenghiran Lookbanyai, Sirimongkol Singwancha V Thong Por Chokchai, and Kyowa V Oleydong Sithsamerchai.

Early next year, two of Thailand's best super bantams, Somsak Sithchatchawal and Poonsawat Kratingdaenggym, will step into the ring together to see who is more deserving of a shot at one of the alphabet trin-

While mismatches continue to be a problem in Thailand, pairing the best the country has to offer is at least a step in the right

Although televised on Thai TV Channel 7, the bout between Kyowa (now calling himself Den Janlapan) and Oleydong Sithsafans keen to see the highly-regarded Kyowa defend his title against the undefeated Sithsamerchai (25-0, 10 Kos) of Trang.

Sithsamerchai made it clear from the opening bell he would not stand in front of Kyowa, electing instead to move side-to-side.

The 29-year-old champion fought aggressively, smiling continuously and advancing without fear while launching the straight right at his southpaw opponent's head.

For the first three rounds, the bout was tit-for-tat, with Sithsamerchai, 22, scoring with short, sneaky lefts then sliding to his right, and Kyowa landing sporadically with his jab. Kyowa pressed forward, relentless in his attack, but relatively ineffective against the quick-footed Sithsamerchai.

By the fourth round Sithsamerchai looked to be tiring, his face showing signs of wear from the stiff jabs of the champion. It was in the middle rounds however when he would do his best work and tally the necessary points to get the victory.

Under the WBC's openscoring policy, the scores after four rounds have to be revealed. These showed the bout as almost dead even: 38-38, 38-38, and 39-38 in favor of Sithsamerchai.

By the sixth, Sithsamerchai

had caught his second wind and was landing his jab-cross combination more often.

He continued to stick to his strategy of moving side-to-side, deftly sliding out of range of Kyowa's increasingly wild punches. After eight, the judges had the bout in favor of Sithsamerchai, 78-75 twice and 78-74.

Recognizing the upset was within his grasp, Sithsamerchai stayed up on his toes and stuck to his game plan - unceasing movement. Whether because he was simply too quick or the champion was too slow, Sithsamerchai managed to make Kyowa look clumsy and confused throughout the bout. In the final rounds though, with Sithsamerchai slowing, Kyowa finally closed the gap and scored on the inside. It was too little, too late though and a stunned Kyowa could do nothing to retain his title.

All three of the judges scored in favor of Sithsamerchai: Fernando Estrella scored the bout 117-112, Brian McMahon had it 115-114, and Gerald Ritter scored it 115-113. Sithsamerchai will reportedly fight a tune-up bout early next year and then travel to Japan, where Kyowa will get a rematch.

"I'm proud of the way I fought today," said Sithsamerchai.. "My opponent was good, he was strong. I knew he would come at me with everything."

Windsurfers from around the world will join local sailors for the rally.



An international jury will be appointed for the competition.


The rally is being held in honor of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej, who turned 80 years old on December 5.

o it's Christmas again, is it? I'm not sure, to be honest. I'm convinced that someone has miscalculated the date. Christmas 2006 was only a few months ago, wasn't it? I'm sure the years pass more quickly the older I get.

If it really is Christmas already, then I will at least try to be festive. So, assuming that it's that time of the year, then Christmas plants have to get a mention. The poinsettia is the most predictable and has been covered in this column ad nauseum. What about the Christmas palm? You know – the one with the red baubles hanging from it? Perhaps less predictable, but still pretty obvious.

None of the above fit the bill, but a sprig of something green, inedible and prickly, with a few red berries, would do the job perfectly. I don't do this often, but this week's aimless ramble concerns a plant not frequently seen in Phuket – holly.

It is possible to cultivate holly in Phuket, but you'll need to follow a few steps beforehand. Basically, you have a couple of options:

1. Fly to England, or somewhere equally inclement, buy a small holly seedling and plant it. Wait 25 years for it to grow to a reasonable size, then fly back to Phuket and show off the festive fruits of your labors to your friends and family.

2. This one needs a little background information for those who aren't from one of the more temperate regions of the world. A greenhouse is small, glass garden shed that makes conditions for plants more bearable when it's cold outside.

Anyway, what's needed to



grow holly in Phuket is a greenhouse in reverse – an "esuchneerg". I'm not sure whether an esuchneerg has ever been built in Phuket, but the specifications are easy if anyone has the time or inclination – you just need to simulate conditions that are cold, wet and miserable.

Should you feel the urge to grow holly using either of the above methods (or even an alternative method of your own), then it requires fertile loamy soil and some shade. Holly grows best in a humid atmosphere. You'll need to be patient, because even in ideal conditions, it grows slowly.

Most holly varieties are evergreen and have red berries that attract birds, squirrels and even deer. The berries it's famous for don't appear spontaneously, though. In order to produce berries, female holly plants need a male plant growing within 10 to 20 meters away. They're dioecious, to use the technical term.

The leaves are bizarre.

in Phuket, but with the holiday season approaching, Bert looks back at memories of holly.

You won't find much of this plant

holly, or *ilex aquifolium*. Unfortunately, I haven't a clue what it's called in Thai – I'm not even sure that there is a Thai name for it. Anyway, this type of holly likes full sun and well-drained acidic soil.

Holly bushes need to be pruned to produce a plant with lots of leaves. You can shape them to just about any geometrical design – just prune back the tips of the current season's growth.

One thing to remember is that holly doesn't like to be moved. Buy small plants and plant them in their permanent position if at all possible. If you want to transplant an established plant, you'll need to remove it carefully with a large root ball and move it to its new home quickly.

To germinate holly seeds, which are in the berries, you'll first need to remove the pulp of

the berries. Once the pulp has gone, you'll need to place the seeds in a stratification system. In a nutshell, this is just placing the seeds in layers of sand covered with leaves, soil or straw, and exposing the lot to winter weather.

Alternate freezing and thawing helps to crack these seeds, so you'll need a fairly advanced esuohneerg. The purpose of this is to keep the seeds either frozen or cool. After the seed coat has cracked, you then take out the holly seeds and plant them in compost.

If anyone has any success with the development of an effective esuohneerg, please let me know – it will also double as a useful beer cooler and storage unit. After all, you need to have something to do while you're waiting for the holly to grow. Oh, and... Merry Christmas.










## **Construction Update**

KAMALA: The Bell housing development is the first project by Asia Orchid Group Co Ltd. Located on 6.5 rai about 1.5 km from Kamala Beach, the development is about 20% complete and on schedule for completion mid-2009.

Construction of the 200-million-baht project, located in Kamala Soi 10, also known as Soi Baan Hua Kuan or "Soi FantaSea", began in June. When complete, The Bell will comprise 17 single-story pool villas on plots ranging from 386 square meters to 506sqm.

There will be one two-bedroom villa, one four-bedroom villa, 14 three-bedroom villas and the largest villa, with five bedrooms, will be occupied by the project owner in order to oversee the housing development's services.

Project manager Anthonie Polfliet told the *Gazette* that after the homes went on sale at the beginning of this month, two were sold off-plan within two weeks.

"We are now doing the first phase of construction, which comprises a reception and office building as well as two show units and all the infrastructure. We are also building the five-bedroom villa for the project owner at the same time," he said.

"Construction of the first three-bedroom show villa is now finished. We are still doing the in-

terior decoration and gardening, which all will be completed around Christmas. The second show unit will be finished in January 2008," he added.

Construction is being carried out by Surin Pandin Tong Co Ltd and the homes have been designed by architects Roof Co Ltd.

The villas will be in contemporary-Balinese style, using cedar roof tiles from Canada to highlight the Balinese look. The contemporary style is exemplified by a color scheme using a combination of black, gray and white with wood highlights throughout the home.

Each three-bedroom villa will have a living space of 255sqm, with each bedroom having an en-suite bathroom and the master bedroom opening directly onto the 4m-by-8.5m pool.

As for the project name, "We wanted a name that was catchy and easy to remember – and also something that we could use to identify the project. We will use bells as decorative features in a small park to mark of the project's identity, too," Mr Polfliet said.

"We will arrange full inhouse management services and

also rental-pool management for owners not using their villas. We will let them out on a daily-rental basis with full resort services. All services will be the same as at a hotel. We will have a facilities building where we can prepare food. We don't have a restaurant – we will deliver food to the villas," explained Mr Polfliet.

"We will also have maids, gardeners, swimming-pool cleaners and 24-hour security guards," he added.

"Our target customers are primarily Scandinavian. We are also targeting other European markets. We haven't done a lot of marketing, but we have received good feedback and we have had walk-in customers.

"We joined two exhibitions in Europe, one in Belgium and one in Netherlands. We had good responses at these expos and many interested people will be coming [to see the development] very soon," Mr Polfliet said.

The houses are being sold on 30-year, twice-renewable leasehold arrangements, at prices ranging from 12.1 million baht for the two-bedroom villa, up to around 14 million baht for three-bedroom villa. The four-bedroom villa is available at 16.3 million baht





huket has seen a flourish of economic growth this year. It has been a banner year for tourism with arrivals likely to exceed 5 million. Hotel-occupancy rates together with average room rates have now surpassed the pre-tsunami boom years. For the property market, though, the year has been a mixed bag given the military coup, foreign-business-act issues and uncertainty over the coming elections.

While the political landscape remains uncertain, the investment climate is buoyant with international investor-driven projects like the Shangri La, Taj, Raffles, Marriot Vacation ownership expansion, The Yamu and Jumeirah Private Island Resort.

Major hotel branding has continued with Accor opening the Mercure in Patong, Singapore's Millennium soon to come at Jungceylon and the opening of four new projects managed under the Marriott's core brand.

Tourism remains a key indicator for property, but the industry has had its ups and downs throughout the year.

The hotel market has hard data available on the number of hotel rooms and occupancy rates. In Thailand's property market, transaction numbers for mid- and upper-level properties are not readily available or on record to

the public. Given the preference of many overseas buyers to obtain leasehold property coupled with the number of projects where sales take place on sharepurchase agreements overseas, tracking transactions through the land department is a daunting task

In early 2007, there was a downward trend in sales, according to most of the larger develop-

ers here. This was to be expected given the political issues and removal of the prime minister in September last year. The fourth quarter is showing an upswing in activity, which is consistent with the arrival of high season.

Keeping track of trends is important in any business and our business does track the hotel market in Bangkok. In a market that caters to a good amount of Jumeirah Private Island Resort is just one example of a local project teaming up with a well-known, international brand for maximum marketing power.

corporate business, the first three quarters of the year saw demand drop by 15% to 20%, but in the fourth quarter, there has been marked recovery and growth despite new accommodation entering the market.

Back in Phuket, new supply is increasing, judging by the number of building sites and bill-

boards around the island. What was once a fledgling market has become an industry in itself. Other overseas markets are keen to use Phuket as a blueprint for their strategies. Within the past three months, we've seen groups from the private and

public sectors of Vietnam, Philippines, Malaysia and China scoping out the Phuket's mixeduse and property markets in search of practices to adopt in their own markets.

In Malaysia, the government has thrown open the doors to the foreign retirement market. In Vietnam, laws have been revised, moving long-term land leases from 50 years to 70 years.

Phuket has become an object of desire for many competing marketplaces in Thailand and in Asia. One key component that is needed is a way to harness the industry in tandem with tourism. While property has been domi-

nated by buyers from Hong Kong, Singapore, the UK and, now, Scandinavia, the key is for demand to keep pace with supply growth. Where will the buyers come from in the next three to five years?

Extending the reach of real estate into new international markets requires overseas marketing. The power of Phuket as a brand name and the diversity within the Phuket and surrounding areas is a unique offering compared with other markets in the region.

The Tourism Authority of Thailand covers too large an area and there is a lack of a Phuket-based organization promoting the common agenda of tourism and related industries, such as property.

There are examples of extremely efficient destination-marketing initiatives that has played

important roles in tourism growth, such as the Singapore Tourist Promotion Board and Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau.

Phuket will hopefully receive a wake-up call soon. The island is so dependent on tourism and its offspring industries.

To fill the new hotels with guests, provide the malls with shoppers and find buyers for the villas and apartments requires investment in collective marketing and a focus on developing new markets to help expand Phuket's market share in the competitive global economy.
