# HK billionaire to develop Phang Nga mega-resort

PHANG NGA: The Year of the Rat is certain to change the fortunes of a sleepy area of Phang Nga province, as a Hong Kong company owned by billionaire Richard Li has announced plans for a mega-resort project along the beach in Thai Muang district.

Land acquired by Li's company Pacific Century Premium Developments Limited (PCPD) in late 2007 totals 1,081.25 rai, with 2.5 kilometers of beach frontage.

The property includes all of the Thai Muang Golf Course, which will be retained and undergo extensive reconstruction.

The 18-hole, Perry Dyedesigned Thai Muang Golf Course first opened in December 1995.

Buildings on the property have been demolished to make way for luxury hotels and villas, as well as yachting, recreational and retail facilities.

Details are being kept under wraps until the master plan is completed.

Award-winning Hong Kong-based architects Original

Vision, which has a branch office in Phuket, has been appointed to design the project.

Asians, Europeans and Americans will be the primary customers, said Jenny Tam, PCPD's head of corporate com-

"We have successfully developed a luxury lifestyle through the Bel-Air experience in Hong Kong. Through the Bel-Air exercise, we have found there are quite a lot of affluent customers who are interested in buying second homes in luxury developments overseas. We believe the Thai Muang Beach Project would become their second home."

Bel-Air is a large luxury apartment complex that forms the residential part of Cyberport, a high-tech hub in Telegraph Bay developed by PCPD's parent company PCCW Limited, of which Richard Li is also the chair-

Ms Tam declined to reveal whether Richard Li, son of Li Ka-shing, reputedly the richest man in Asia, was personally involved in the transaction or if he will have his own private residence on site. It is also not known if the "digital city" concept on which Cyberport is based will be brought to Thai Muang.

She also declined to confirm or deny newspaper and online reports of the land acquisition price tag of 2 billion baht.

Ms Tam said that the project would take "a few years" to finish, but added that it was too early to estimate the completion date.

PCPD is involved in the development and management of premium property and infrastructure projects throughout the Asia-Pacific region. It is majorityowned by PCCW, Hong Kong's largest communications provider and the world's largest provider of Internet Protocol TV. PCCW employs about 14,000 people in Asia, the US and the Middle

Richard Li, 41, is ranked 698th in Forbes magazine's World's Richest People list, with an estimated net worth of US\$1.5 billion.

# Danish tourist believed murdered: police

PATONG: Kathu Police are treating as a murder case the death of Danish tourist Henrik Rasmussen, 47, whose body was discovered in a section of Klong Pakbang behind the Royal Paradise Hotel late afternoon February 7, Pol Capt Pratuang Pholmana of Kathu Police Station told the Gazette.

Helen Soerenson told the *Gazette* that she last saw her cousin, Mr Rasmussen, who suffered from Down syndrome, at the Royal Paradise Hotel about 4:30 am on January

wallet, which contained money, as well as a patient's card issued by Patong Hospital and some slips indicating that he had been a guest at the Royal Paradise Hotel, Kathu Police Superintendent Col Grissak Songmoonnark later explained.

Capt Pratuang speculated that Mr Rasmussen died from two wounds caused by a sharp object: a five-centimeter laceration down to the bone on the back of the neck and a wound about 10cm long to the right

Mr Rasmussen's nephew Kasper said Police also recovered Mr Rasmussen's that his uncle's body was found in what he described as "a well" located just meters behind the hotel.

"We have questioned Mr Rasmussen's cousin and nephew and I am satisfied that neither of them have anything to do with the death," said Capt Pratuang.

"We believe that he died inside the hotel. The police need time to investigate the case now," he added.

# PPHO to clear the haze on smoking ban

PHUKET: While the ban on smoking in air-conditioned areas in bars, restaurants and nightclubs came into effect in Bangkok on February 11, entertainment venue and restaurant operators in Phuket have a temporary reprieve.

Venue operators and smokers found breaking the new law in Phuket will not be fined until after the Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) has launched a public awareness campaign, Prapa Nakara, chief of the PPHO's anti-smoking unit, has told the Gazette.

Fines set out in the new law stand at 2,000 baht per patron found smoking illegally and 20,000 baht for venue operators found with patrons breaking the law on their premises.

'In Phuket, we want to warn both smokers and restaurant owners about the new law first. So we will conduct a public awareness campaign before enforcing the new law," said K. Prapa.

K. Prapa and PPHO Chief Dr Paisan Worrasathit are in Surat Thani attending a seminar organized by the Public Health Ministry to educate officers about the smoking ban.

Some confusion about the new rules has arisen. The notice posted on the Ministry of Public Health website says that the ban affects all air-conditioned areas in bars, restaurants and nightclubs.

The notice also says that venue operators can designate smoking zones, but does not specify whether those zones can be indoors or outdoors.

The notice also says that open-air restaurants, specifically, must ban smoking in all areas except in designated zones. The same applies to private company air-conditioned premises.

The notice does not mention whether the ban applies to openair areas of entertainment venues, such as beer bars, which are common in Patong.

# Thieves make off with B2m in two break-ins

PHUKET: Police on January 31 reported two major robberies, including a daylight break-in at the residence of a high-ranking civil ser-

The first robbery took place in Pa Khlok late the night of January 29 or early the morning of January 30.

Pol Maj Seksan Komsakorn of the Thalang Police told the Gazette that the break-in was reported by Winai Rattanawittayaporn, owner of the Bang Pae Wassadu construction materials shop.

The thief or thieves gained entrance by breaking through a window after the shop had closed at 6 pm on Tuesday, Maj Seksan said.

K. Winai, who discovered the break-in the following morning, needed a full day to inventory the missing goods before contacting the police about 10:30 am on Thursday.

Reported stolen were 23 uncashed checks from customers with a total value of 1.9 million baht, along with 30,000 baht in cash, four large crates of cigarettes valued at nearly 200,000 baht and cell phone refill cards worth

The case is now being investigated, Pol Maj Seksan said.

About 3:30 pm on January 31, Phuket City Police were notified of another breakin, this time at the residence of Pairoj Gaygeena, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer (*Palad*) of Phuket City Municipality.

Phuket City Police Duty Officer Lt Salaan Rideng told police the break-in happened some time between 10 am and 2 pm.

K. Pairoj reported the robbery after returning home just after 2 pm to find the thieves had removed glass louvers to gain access to his home on Palien Rd.

The back door was left open and the home was ransacked, K. Pairoj told police.

Among the items reported missing were a .38mm pistol, a gold ring, a gold necklace and a Buddha image. The value of the haul was estimated at 190,000 baht, he added.

Detectives found fingerprints at the scene and have already identified a group of likely suspects. The daytime break-in was the first in the area, which is home to many civil servants who live in government-provided lodging, said police.

The break-in apparently occurred sometime after the victim's maid went home and before K. Pairoj returned home, Lt Salaan said.

Police expect to charge those responsible "within two weeks", he added.

# Seaplanes ordered to land further from shore

PATONG: Phuket Vice-Governor Smith Palawatvichai this morning confirmed that Destination Air has been ordered to have its seaplanes that land on Patong Bay land further from the shore.

"After flying with Destination Air, I can now understand the noise problem, even though the planes take only about one-anda-half minutes taking off.

The planes should not disturb the tourists on Patong Beach much, but they still make a loud noise and they land here nearly every day," he said.

"I have ordered them to land far away from any big hotels and resorts and have suggested that they have taxis pick up their customers from a landing point further away," V/Gov Smith added.

"We would like to check all details of the conditions in the flight permit from the Department of Civil Aviation, such as what level of noise in decibels they are allowed, and we would also like to check the environmental effect of the planes, too," he said.

V/Gov Smith leads the investigation committee into complaints made about the noise the planes make. The committee also includes Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Col Chalit Tinthanee, Phuket City Police Traffic Inspector Maj Teerawat Leamsuwan, Phuket Marine Office 5 Chief Olarn Hengcharoen and Phuket Provincial Fisheries Office Chief Pairoh Sutthakarn.

The committee has already confirmed that Destination Air has permission to land at Koh Racha Yai, Koh Racha Noi, Yacht Haven, Chalong Bay, Patong Beach, Cape Panwa, Koh Naka Noi and the north and south ends of Bang Tao Bay.

However, the seaplanes serving Patong are breaking new ground for administrators. "This case is new for Phuket. We cannot just ignore complaints, nor can we ban the seaplanes from flying because they have a permit." V

Sriwisut, 34, coinciding with the reward money offered being doubled to 20,000 baht.


The reward money was paid to K. Thanapong, who works as a handyman at Royal Paradise Hotel, on February 12.

"Not many people are ever in the place where Mr Rasmussen was found. I will question staff at the hotel, including security guards, handymen and anyone else who may have been in that area," said Capt Pra-

Police have been unable to draw any leads from CCTV-camera footage in the hotel because data is automatically deleted after three days, Capt Pratuang explained.

Mr Rasmussen's cousin Helen, who had come to Thailand on holiday with him, told the Gazette that she will stay in Thailand until Mr Rasmussen's body has been cremated.

She will then fly back to Copenhagen with his ashes.

# tires to end driving spree

PHUKET CITY: A high-speed chase through Phuket City came to an end about midday on February 4 when police shot out the tires of a pickup being driven by a man suffering from severe stress, with the pickup crashing into a concrete pole on Soi Korpai, off Phuket Rd.

Phuket City Police Duty Officer Maj Keerati Triwai explained that Kusoldharm Foundation driver Ekachai Samudrat had responded to a call from staff at the Honda showroom on Phang Nga Rd. They reported that a man was walking down the middle of the road, apparently trying to be run over by a car.

When K. Ekachai arrived at the scene, he invited the man, Wirat Maneesri, 44, to sit in his truck's passenger seat. However, when K. Ekachai got out of the vehicle to ask a police patrol officer where he could take Wirat for treatment, Wirat slid into the driver's seat, put the truck in gear and sped off along Weerapong Hongyok Rd, Maj Keerati said.

He and several other police officers gave chase on motorbikes. During the pursuit, Wirat rammed a Mazda pickup waiting at traffic lights on Weerapong Hongyok Rd, causing the Mazda to hit another Mazda pickup waiting in front of it, Maj Keerati said.

The drivers of those pickups were not injured, he added.

Wirat continued driving even after police shot out one of his back tires. As the truck neared the Soi Korpai-Phuket Rd T-junction, police opened fire again, this time hitting one of the front tires, Maj Keerati said.

The pickup finally slowed, veered and then crashed into a concrete post supporting a heavy metal fence, he said.

Wirat was apprehended and taken to Vachira Phuket Hospital for treatment of minor injuries, Maj Keerati added.

On February 5, Wirat was sent to Phuket Provincial Prison, where he remains after being charged with dangerous driving causing property damage and evading arrest, he said.

Relatives have so far paid 150,000 baht for repairs to the three vehicles, he added.

After questioning the suspect, police learned that Wirat was on medication for stress and had just received some "bad news" from doctors about a medical condition, he said.



# Police shoot out | Tourism leaders voice support for Weerasak

PHUKET: Leading figures in Phuket's tourism industry have expressed satisfaction with the naming of Chart Thai Party member Weerasak Kowsurat as the new Tourism and Sports Minister in the Cabinet led by Prime Minister Samak Sundaravej.

K. Weerasak, 43, is Deputy Secretary of the Chart Thai Party. He has a master's degree in law from Harvard University. Originally from Ratchathani province, K. Weerasak has held several advisory and vice-ministerial positions in previous governments, including the first Thaksin administra-

Phuket Tourist Association President Maitree Narukatpichai told the Gazette, "I know of him only from the media, but his background and personality give me more confidence in him than [I've had in] some previous tourism and sports ministers. Also, he is still young and appears to have good ideas."

However, K. Maitree said that he did not expect much help from the new government in funding urgently needed infrastructure projects to deal with Phuket's pressing problems, such as the waste management crisis and increasing traffic con-

"Such problems are beyond the ability of local bodies to solve. As for marketing the island, I think we can handle that on our own," he said.

PTA Vice-President Bhuritt Maswongssa agreed that K. Weerasak's background and experience as a lawyer made him well-suited for the post. "I think lawyers are men of principle," he

K. Bhuritt, who until recently went by the first name "Panu", suggested that the new minister establish a special economic and administrative zone for Ranong, Phang Nga, Phuket, Krabi and Trang.

Collectively, these provinces generate two-thirds of Thailand's tourism industry revenue, he claimed.

Phuket Chamber of Commerce President Thavornwongwongse said that he hoped K. Weerasak would meet the island's tourism industry leaders and listen carefully to their input when formulating

policy.
"I believe he has the right knowledge and capability for this position," he said.

# Frenchman charged with shoplifting in Patong

PATONG: A 68-year-old Frenchman has been charged with stealing leather goods valued at more than 30,000 baht from the Findig store on the Patong beach road.

Capt Naruwat Phutharaviro of Kathu Police Station told the Gazette that he received a call from Findig shop manager Nathaya Prasomthong, 34, at 4:20 pm February 11.

K. Nathaya reported that a well-dressed foreign tourist had been caught stealing seven leather-good items valued at more than 30,000 baht from the store, he said.


Police arrived at the store and arrested Jacques Andre Roland Marecaux, charging him with stealing five crocodile leather bags, a wallet and a pair of crocodile leather shoes.

"Shop staff have been keeping an eye on customers after they found that leather bags were missing from the store. They kept an eye on Marecaux as he was carrying a big bag while looking around the shop, then they

finally caught him," he added

Capt Naruwat said that Marecaux confessed to the charges.

"Once his case has been heard in court we will hand it over to Immigration for further action." he said.



# Frogman victim

Alain Oberson was in Kata Bay aboard his 39-foot yacht *Merlin* with 24-year-old Thai bar hostess Pornthip Pradit. Then along swam German Peter Schmid, clad in a blue wetsuit, who came aboard for a cup of coffee and a rest from his swim. Then a fight ensued: Oberson was shot and stabbed, but lived; Schmid was later found dead in the water some 70 meters away. The tale sparked rumors and speculation island-wide about what happened that night. Here, Oberson speaks with the *Gazette*'s Skyler Swezy to set the record straight.

has shaved his head since a gun blast singed the hair around his left ear. A pair of gray crutches lean against the table at a café in Chalong. The wiry sailor rubs a healing stab wound on his right calf as he recounts how it got there.

A boat builder by profession, Oberson built his 39-foot sloop *Merlin*, on which he has spent the past eight years sailing with his wife and children. They lived on the boat, docking in Australia, New Zealand and Bali, where he would find temporary boat-work to support them.

Oberson and his wife separated about five months ago. She returned to Switzerland with their young twins and he remained in Bali.

Soon after, his long-term friend Bernard Loude flew from Switzerland to Bali to help him sail the boat back to Europe.

At the beginning of January this year, Oberson's mother and sister brought his son and daughter to Thailand so he could see his children while he prepared for the journey back to Switzerland.

After holidaying in Kata, the Oberson family decided stay at a resort on Koh Racha for a few days, but Oberson and Loude needed to renew their visas. On January 9, they left the family on

Koh Racha, returned to Kata Bay and dropped anchor.

That night, the pair visited a Kata bar where 24-year-old Porntip Pradit worked. Oberson had known her for a couple weeks and she had previously stayed with him on the boat. He asked Bernard to remain at the bar so he and Porntip could have some privacy on the yacht.


Back on the boat that night, sometime between 10 and 11 pm, Oberson and Porntip heard a voice call out from the water.

"I had some music on and I heard somebody yell, 'Hey! Hey!' I went to have a look and it was a guy snorkeling, wearing a wetsuit. He told me, 'I come swimming from Patong, I am a little bit tired. May I get a rest with you?' I invited him on board to have some coffee and chocolate," Oberson said.

The 35-year-old German, Peter Michael Schmid, climbed aboard. He had with him a pair of flippers, a snorkel, mask and a dry bag. Oberson gave him some coffee and chocolate.

"We started talking and he was interested in my boat. I was more interested in what he was doing and asked him how he could swim so far because I know the current can be very strong.

"He asked me about the navigation system. Do I have GPS? One thing that was strange



was something he said about the price. He told me, 'but it's a million-dollar boat?' And I said no, it took me 10 years to build this boat, so for me it has no price."

They drank beer and smoked some cigarettes, then Oberson asked Schmid to leave.

"I say okay, well, maybe you go because I am with my girl-friend. Schmid went back and got the waterproof bag. I was talking with my girlfriend and when I turned to Schmid again, he had a gun, a knife and a roll of adhesive tape in his hands," said Oberson.

"Pointing the gun at me and pointing the knife at Porntip, he told her to tie me up with the tape. I was really scared to be tied up on the boat. If he had just told me to go away in the dinghy, I would have gone.

"I didn't want to let myself be tied. I moved in front of him and I made a little bit like I was crying. I asked why he do this,

while looking at the gun," Oberson recounted.

When Oberson moved in front of him, Schmid said, "I'm getting nervous. I don't want to hurt you so let the girl tie you."

Oberson decided he couldn't let himself be tied and thinking the pistol wasn't real, he chose to act.

"The gun didn't look like a real gun, and I saw maybe I have a chance. He was in a very bad place on the boat. If I pushed him, he'd fall in the water; that was my idea. I looked at the gun and jumped at him, but he shot me at this moment. It just stopped me. I had long hair before and my hair was burning. I realized I still had power and pushed him off."

Schmid and was pulled into the water with him as he fell into the

"She can't swim so I was really scared she'd go down. She swam like a dog, but pretty fast and reached the dinghy. All this time I had to watch her because if she sank, I'd jump in."

Oberson went on to explain that Schmid didn't pursue Porntip, instead, heading for the boat's stern. Oberson met him there and began kicking Schmid as he tried to climb aboard. Schmid stabbed and slashed Oberson with his knife, he said.

have nearly healed. The back of his right calf was cut deep and there are raised scars on his upper left thigh and the underside of both thighs.

"He cannot come on the boat, so he tells me, 'I will kill the girl first.' I was scared something would happen to the girl."

Oberson grabbed the dinghy line and pulled, while Schmid tried to climb onto the autopilot frame mounted to the transom.

"I pulled the rope and she jumped onto the boat. It's not easy, but she did it, just like the swimming. At this stage he stabbed me in the ribs. Before he's always in the water and cannot reach. But when I pulled the dinghy he can climb a little bit," Oberson said, pulling up his shirt to reveal a healed stab wound on his lower left ribs. Luckily for Oberson, the knife didn't pass through his rib cage.

Oberson tried to take Schmid's knife, but Schmid had wrapped around his wrist a rope attached to the handle. Holding onto the autopilot frame, Schmid is still half in the water, so Oberson retains the upper ground.

"We were fighting, I tried to get the knife, but it was attached to his hand with a rope. I smashed him in the face and he fell down again. After, I was in really bad shape, I was bleeding a lot. I was in a panic. I shouted for Porntip to find me something to hit back with, but she doesn't know the boat. If I had time in the beginning I have



a big machete and I could have just stopped him," he said.

Oberson grabbed a fishing rod to hit Schmid, but quickly lost it. "I just didn't want him to come back on the boat because I was sure he would kill me. After I lost the fishing rod, I remembered my fishing hook," he added.

Oberson flipped open the lid of a storage compartment under a bench in the cockpit and grabbed the gaff.

"I got the hook and I smashed him maybe three times."

Oberson thinks he slashed Schmid's forearm one of the times he pulled the hook back. Wounded, Schmid grabbed the side of the small fiberglass dinghy; his weight tipped the dinghy and submerged it.

"I saw the guy and I thought he was swimming away, but in the end I think he was just drifting with the current. At this time I got the flare gun and made the VHF 'mayday' call," he recalled.

Oberson fired a flare while Porntip called the police on her cell phone. He put one more flare cartridge in the gun and handed it to her saying, "If he comes back, just shoot him."

'After that, I fell down next to the table and I think she was shouting, 'Wake up! Wake up!'

and maybe she fired another flare at that point, I can't really remember."

A longtail boat transported Oberson to the beach. Once he was ashore, an ambulance rushed him to hospital.

Schmid's body was found

floating in the bay. He had died from blood loss.

"I never want to kill, I just want to save my life and my girlfriend's life. Killing is the last thing you want to do in your life. The story ends there, but it is a story that will haunt me for the rest of my life," Oberson said.

"I am not Rambo; I was just scared. People ask me why I let Schmid on the boat in the first place. Me, I'm Swiss flag and it's my duty to help people in the water. I would do it again, but obviously I would ask to see what's in their bag," he smiled.

Porntip Pradit returned to her hometown in Trang after being questioned and corroborating the series of events that night.

Today, little is known as to why Peter Michael Schmid boarded the Merlin with a knife and a homemade gun.

While police have finished their initial investigation and are awaiting some lab results, Oberson's passport has been withheld by the police until a decision is reached as to whether Oberson killed in self-defense.

Kata resident Benno Brandon, who knew Schmid, said, "We knew him as a non-aggressive and gentle person. This does not fit my impression of him, I think most people would agree."

# Abbot killed in 'chicken shoot'

KAMPHAENG PHET: A temple abbot was shot dead February 5 after one of his students mistook him for a chicken.

Phra Khru Silwachirakan, known to his followers as Luang Por Pheuan, the abbot of Wat Traiphum in Phrankratai district, was tending cattle belonging to the wat with three followers, Phra Pui, 27, Sanong Phobanlang, 37, and Buntham Phairoj, 54, when the incident occurred.

Phra Pui said that he was stood chatting with K. Sanong when he heard a gunshot. Buntham then ran up to them looking shocked and said that Luang Por Pheuan had been wounded.

The men rushed to the abbot, who was leaning against a tree, his robe covered in blood. The sturdy monk, however, insisted that he was ok and just asked for his friends to roll him a cigarette.

off driving the abbot to hospital, but the abbot died on route.

Maj Gen Thamnun Phetchburikul, commander of Kamphaeng Phet Provincial Police, ordered his officers to question Buntham about the incident.

Police said that at first, Buntham gave contradictory statements about how the shooting happened, but eventually confessed that he had accidentally shot the abbot.

Buntham told police that he had been walking in the woods with a 12-gauge shotgun, one of three shotguns donated to the wat, which the abbot liked to bring along when tending the cattle.

He heard a sound like a chicken scratching in the dirt and looked over to a tree stump and saw some movement in the bushes. Thinking that it must be

Phra Pui said that they set a chicken, he opened fire, police said.

Phra Khru Silwachirakan had been abbot of Wat Traiphum since 1990 and had declined the post of Tambon Dean so that he could remain abbot at the wat. He had many pupils in Prankratai District and everyone was very sorry to hear of his death, K. Julaphan said.

# Youths keen on learning safe sex

eenagers want sex education and they want it from their parents and teachers, a recent survey has revealed. The survey was conducted by Thai Youth Network on HIV/Aids, Program for Appropriate Technology in Health, and the Rajabhat Institute at Ban Somdej Chao Phya between October and November last year.

The survey polled the attitudes towards sex of 2,000 teenagers aged between 15 and 22 years from 11 provinces in different regions throughout Thailand

It found that 72.5% wanted teachers and parents to give them clear information about sex.

Almost 74% wanted parents to be open-minded when they talked about sex, and relationships.

Over 76% wanted sex education on the school curriculum and 56% wanted teachers to show them how to use condoms and explain sexual intercourse.

A group of 60.5% wanted information about safe sex on television before 10 pm.

Almost 66% said that condoms should be available at schools, while 48.8% thought that teenage sex was acceptable.

Meanwhile, the Public Health Ministry expected new HIV/Aids infections would increase to 14,000 this year – with most cases teenagers not practicing safe sex.

Director of the ministry's Global Fund on Aids, Tuberculosis and Malaria, Dr Anupong Chitwarakorn, said that b parents and teachers should educate children about safe sex to prevent HIV/Aids infections.

The ministry will spend 30 million baht on a campaign encouraging teenagers not to be embarrassed about carrying condoms, he said.

**Puffed up.** Responding to the Public Health Ministry's regulation to ban smoking in air-conditioned pubs, discos and clubs,

Metropolitan Police announced that all of Bangkok's 88 police stations were ready to arrest and fine any rule breakers.

City Deputy Police Commissioner Maj Gen Suporn Phanseua said that all officers were ready to reinforce the new rule by fining smokers 2,000 baht and venue operators 20,000 baht.

Police will act on public complaints or the Public Health Ministry's request for inspection of entertainment establishments, rather than pressuring the establishments themselves, he said.

Smoking is already prohibited in air-conditioned restaurants but the ministry's regulation to include air-conditioned pubs, discos, bars and parts of outdoor public venues, including markets, comes into effect on February 17.

**Serious business.** A member of the Law Society of Thailand has warned new Interior Minister

Chalerm Yoobamrung not to resort to summary executions in his new "war on drugs".

Somchai Homlaor, chairman of the human rights committee of the Law Society of Thailand, said it was good that K. Chalerm had declared to tackle the problems of drug trade within 90 days.

However, he said K. Chalerm should not make the same mistakes as the Thaksin government's war-on-drug campaign, which saw more than 2,500 people killed.

If K. Chalerm repeats the same mistake, people would take to streets to oust him from the office, K. Somchai warned.

Promissory notes. Kamphaeng Phet residents last year had the largest debts in the country, with each family on average being indebted by 49,465 baht, Community Development Department (CDD) chief Preecha Butrsri said on February 9.

Phuket residents were the least in debt, with each family on average owing just 484 baht, he said.

The CDD report said that last year about 29.9 million rural people, or 7.7 million households, had an average annual income of 135,325.39 baht per household, or about 34,900 baht per person per year.

In general, each household had annual average expenses of 69,764 baht, or 18,025 baht per person per year.

Rural people had debts of 18,786 baht per family and only about 7,353 baht savings per family, K. Preecha said.

Nonthaburi province had the highest income (263,531 per family per year) while Chumphon earned the lowest (75,152 baht per family per year), on average.

**Serious charge.** Many physically disabled women lost their chance to become mothers after were subjected to sterilization without their knowledge or permission, a government official has alleged.

Nattaya Boonpakdee, who heads the Thai Health Promotion Foundation's sexual-health promotion division, said some of the women didn't even know when their sterilizations took place.

The women found out the harsh reality only after they visited doctors to check why they were not becoming pregnant after being married for a long time, she told a recent seminar on sexuality.

Very often public health officials urge disabled women to undergo sterilization, admitted Dr Penchan Pradubmook-Sherer of the Mahidol University.

A disabled woman once complained that she was sterilized because government officials were afraid that she would become pregnant if raped, Dr Penchan added.

**Mystery debt.** A former Army officer filed a police complaint after the Student Loan Fund (SLF) sent an invoice for his daughter to repay a student loan of 65,000 baht – although his daughter died of chicken pox 26 years ago, when she was 18 months old.

Lt Col Prajin Chatjoho said that he had received a letter from the SLF claiming that his daughter Nattayanee Chatjoho owed 65,000 baht in student loans and must start repaying with 26,000 baht by March 31 or the SLF would revoke the loan and collect the whole amount.

Presenting Nattayanee's birth and death certificates to reporters, Lt Col Prajin said he had not been able to reach anyone at the SLF phone number on the letter so had asked for his daughter's "loan application" documents from the Nakhon Ratchasima Educational Area 1 Office.

Told to contact the SLF, he decided to file a police complaint so officials could investigate how such a thing could happen, he said.

# uslim students detained in a military camp in Pattani on January 31 told families and friends they had been tortured. "They said someone had covered their heads with sacks before beating them. Their attackers wanted them to confess," said Hareedi Pohsu, vice secretary-general of Yala Students Federation.

K. Hareedi led the group of families and friends to visit six students of Yala Rajabhai University and the Yala Institute of Physical Education who had been detained at Inkhayuth military camp.

Plainclothes officials from Special Force Unit 11 on January 27 searched the university's dormitories and arrested seven students, accusing them of involvement in the insurgency and took them to the military camp.

Their captors also seized a notebook computer, a motorcycle and seven mobile phones from the students. Two more students were arrested on January 29.

The detainees were forced to remain outside in all weather conditions and were interrogated for periods of up to six hours, they said.

Col Acra Thiproj, spokesman for the Internal Security Operation Command – Fourth Area, said he was unaware of any torture at the camp.

The families of the students should petition the Fourth Army Area commander if they have evidence of such events, he suggested.


Col Acra said he had been informed by the investigation that the students were former classmates from Thammawittaya Islamic Private School and that four had been members of a militant organization called Runda Kumpulan Kecil (RKK) since 2003.

They confessed that they had been involved in many violent cases, he added.

The others were arrested and detained because they were together at the same place.

Officials found a device giving instructions on how to make a bomb, but no one claimed ownership of the gadget, Col Acra said.

# Students allege torture as Southern violence continues

The Yala Students Federation and human-rights groups are helping families of the students to collect evidence and may file a lawsuit against those who committed human-rights violations, said K. Hareedi.

The violence in the Deep South has seen a resurgence in recent weeks after a period of relative calm. A Muslim woman and two Muslim men were killed in two separate drive-by shootings in Yala February 10.

Two soldiers were also injured when insurgents detonated a bomb to ambush them the same morning.

**Snookered.** A snooker hustler from Nakhon Sri Thammarat City was murdered in the province's Chang Klang district February 8, apparently after humiliating two local players.

Suphap Pankradam, 25, was shot in the face, back and thigh, and stabbed in the back next to a snooker table at a venue in Tambon Chang Klang, Village 9.

Relatives rushed him to Nabon Hospital, where he was pronounced dead on arrival.

After questioning witnesses, investigating officer Lt Col Chanyut Thongsoi said the victim was in the area to visit relatives.

A keen snooker player, Suphap had found a snooker table and challenged two local snooker players to a game. He won easily, then allegedly mocked the local men and refused to play a rematch, Col Chanyut said.

Police identified the two men only as "Khiow" and "Chit", both aged between 35 and 40.

"After losing, the pair [Khiow and Chit] left for a while

before coming back with a gun. They then beat K. Suphap and shot him until he was dead before fleeing the scene.

"K. Suphap's relatives took him to hospital, but we believe he died at the scene of the attack. We are now collecting evidence to request an arrest warrant for the suspects," Col Chanyut said.

**Migrant massacre.** The bodies of four murdered people, all thought to have been Burmese migrant workers, were found in a rubber plantation in Surat Thani's Chaiya district on February 5.

Police said that the bodies, discovered by a local rubber tapper, were of two men and two women, all aged 25 to 30 years old. One of the women was about six months pregnant. All of the victims had their hands tied be-

hind their backs, two with electrical cord and two with rubber bungees.

The bodies were found in a plantation belonging to Jamrat Khongkaphan. All had been shot repeatedly in the body. From the bullet pattern, police suspect that they may have been trying to run away when they were gunned down. Police collected seven 11mm bullet cases at the scene.

A Burmese man named "Ay" managed to escape the mass killing. After being shot several times, he lay in the undergrowth until the attackers left. He then crawled to a workers' house, where he asked to be taken to hospital.

Villagers told police that they had heard gunshots around midnight, long before Ay came looking for help between 3 am and 4 am. They also said that they did not recognize any of the victims.

Police believe there were four or five killers. They are likely to be local men who know the area well, as the road leading to the crime scene was secluded and extremely steep, accessible only to four-wheel-drive vehicles and even then still treacherous to any driver unfamiliar with the route, police said.

Lt Col Surasak Thiprat, Head of the Tambon Mo Thai Police Station, said that he believed that police would be able to learn the motive for the killings by interviewing Ay, but only after he had sufficiently recovered

Ay, who was last reported to be in critical condition, was transferred to Surat Thani Central Hospital for an operation and further intensive care treatment.

# A welcome reception to the past

huket is blessed with a rich history of visiting ambassadors from lands afar, adding their contraptions, traditions and lifestyles to the melting pot of Chinese, European, Malay and other cultures on the island.

The landmarks of Phuket's vibrant life of yesteryear still stand but are now surrounded by modern shopping malls and entertainment venues for trendy teenagers. One of the city's prominent landmarks in the 1960s, the 200-room Thavorn Hotel on Rassada Rd, was Phuket's first five-star hotel and the first establishment on the island to have an elevator.

These days, the hotel seems like just another old building along the road, but a peek inside gives an insight into days gone by on the island. Adjoining the hotel lobby is a series of rooms joined by wooden archways leading through a fascinating collection of antique contraptions, fading photographs and all sorts of tin mining paraphernalia.

The items contained in these musty rooms are much older than

the hotel, which was built in 1961. The collection features more than 1,000 items, most of which are at least 100 years old.

world stuck in time. There are so many things depicting daily life so long ago that it invokes goosebumps. Even the people in the The collection recreates a photographs hanging on the walls

seem to stare back at you.

First to catch the eye is an oversized "Lotus pan" with a label in Thai and English explaining that it was used to cook rice for some 200 tin mine workers more than 100 years ago. With the artifact within an arm's reach, it is easy to imagine a crowd of workers lining up for their food in the way they would in a large factory today.

Next to the pan stands a wooden trunk that would have held the clothes and possessions of one of the workers, explained Hotel Manager Prateep Chairchai. "This Chinese 'safe deposit box' is more than 200 years old. It would have usually been kept locked and coins would have been dropped into it through a slit in the lid.

The collection of antiques

once belonged to the hotel's founder, Tilok Thavornvongwongse, who also owned several tin mines in Phuket and the neighboring provinces. The collection today belongs to K. Tilok's son,

The antiques seem to radiate a positive aura – as if they are alive with the love and passion that went into making them. "The artifacts are like a reminder that everyone's life will eventually come to an end, but that something will always remain to mark that time in history," said. K. Prateep.

A large metal contraption in the center of the room is puzzling at first sight. Of all things, it is a 100-year-old movie projector. Apparently K. Dilok owned two movie theaters in Phuket, including the once-popular Paradise theater, which stood where the Ocean shopping mall is today.


Two sabers in a glassfronted case are much older than the projector, and apparently of much greater significance. They are the weapons used by Phuket's famed heroines, Tao "Jan" Thepkrasattri and Tao "Muk" Sri Soonthorn, who led islanders to victory over Burmese invaders in 1785.

The many black-and-white photographs on the walls show wide dirt roads filled with people and carts long before cars were brought to the island. There is also a picture of Phuket Airport dated 1930 and an image of Ranong Rd during the 1940s.

The collection is so large and varied that it is impossible to mention everything in this col-

The museum is open daily, but there are no set opening hours. The entrance fee for foreigners is 30 baht; Thais get in for free. For more information call the Thavorn Hotel at 076-211333.





# She's having a 'belly' good time

lexandra was smitten with the sensual dance of the Middle East at 26 years old. It was one of those pivotal moments in her life that brought the shy, almost agoraphobic girl out of her shell and onto the stage to shake sensuously for rapt audiences.

It startd with a visit to a Moroccan restaurant near her hometown in Los Angeles, where she had gone with some friends. At the restaurant a belly dancer was performing for the diners. Alexandra realized then that belly dancing was the missing piece in her life and she immediately began taking classes and practicing daily until she herself became a professional belly dancer.

audiences. Shortly after joining the pro belly dancing-circuit she took part in a competition where she got the chance to meet and talk to the woman who had originally inspired her to take up belly dancing. They soon became good friends, pairing up to teach others and performing for parties and events.

Alexandra is a woman of contrasts. She originally qualified as a science and math teacher in her native US. She came to Phuket on holiday but ended up staying, taking up a teaching position at Prince of Songkhla University.

At first Alexandra was a bit sceptical about how Thais would perceive belly dancing and kept her hobby quiet, but when some of her students heard of Alexandra's extra curricular dancing, they pleaded with her to teach them.

"Knowing that Thais are fairly conservative and seeing the very gentle and controlled style of traditional Thai dancing, I was worried at first that the students who had never seen this kind of dancing before would not take to it, but the reaction was amazing, they loved it!" said Alexandra.

"For the first belly dancing class I dressed down a bit,


covering up a bit more than I usually would for a performance but the girls were so into it that I soon realized there was no need to tone things down for them," she added.

"Each audience reacts differently when confronted with a belly dancer and I have to gauge their reaction as I'm performing.


"Surprisingly though, Thai audiences seem to be much more at ease with the sensuality of belly dancing and really seem to enjoy both watching and joining in. It's much easier to elicit audience participation from a Thai audience than it is from some of the European audiences I've performed for," she said.

"When I'm out there on stage or dancing around tables and interacting with the audience, westerners will sometimes become uncomfortable and show their discomfort by trying their hardest to carry on with their meal as if nothing's going on around them. Some will not even dare to look up from the table at me," she added.

"I danced for an alumni party recently and the feedback was great. The audience really enjoyed it and many of them came up to me afterwards saying how amazing it was and that

they'd never seen anything like it that's how I'd like to pass on the before. I saw one of the hosts a few days later and he told me again how much he'd enjoyed the show and that he couldn't sleep the night after the party because he was so blown away by the belly dancing," she said.

"Belly dancing has its roots in the Middle East, it's part of Arabic and North African culture and Egypt is considered the center of the folk dance. Each region has its own version of belly dancing.

"The costumes don't vary too much but as you cross the continents, you see the adaptations in style and it eventually melds into a Latino style, much like Flamenco,"

"I think the most attractive aspect of belly dancing is that it is all about individual passion and expression.

"Although belly dancing is quite a complex dance, it's not overly structured like ballet or jazz dance.

"Of course, there are many techniques and moves to learn, but I was taught to be improvisational with my dancing, and dance to others – allowing them to focus on the artistic expression of belly dancing rather than focusing purely on the technical aspects of the moves," she said.

"To me, belly dancing is more like a personal, artistic ex-





## Ssangyong keeps it simple n SUV that is rarely seen in Phuket – al though they are often seen on the streets of

Bangkok – is the Korean-built Ssangyong Kyron. Ssangyong is majority owned by Shanghai Automotive Industry Corporation (SAIC), which acquired 51% of the company in October 2004. Its products, however, owe much to outdated Mercedes-Benz technology. That is not to say the vehicles themselves are outdated – far from it – as they are comprehensively equipped and represent excellent value.

Nanjing Auto, the makers of MG sportscars, recently announced a tie-up with SAIC, as the Chinese government endeavors to unify its major automakers. Under the deal, Nanjing will own around 10% of

SAIC.

The Kyron, launched at the Frankfurt motorshow in 2005, sells for just over 2 million baht, but for that you get an eightway power driver's seat; four-way for the front passenger.

There is electronic cruise control. hill-descent control, automatic headlamps, rain-sensing wipers and more

Power comes from an excellent, if a little harsh, two-liter common-rail turbodiesel, delivering 140bhp (103kW), with a mas-

sive 310Nm of torque, produced over a low-rev range of 1,800 to 2,750rpm.

Carbon emissions, which appear to be taking on

greater importance as global warming becomes more of an issue, are a reasonable 217g/km CO2.

The motor is mated Mercedes-Benz-By Jeff Heselwood sourced five-speed automatic transmis-

> sion with Tiptronic control. Oddly, it possesses two reverse gears but it is unlikely under normal conditions these would be required. Top speed is quoted at around 165kmh, while acceleration from rest to 100kmh takes a leisurely 14.2 seconds.



Opinions vary on the ride of the Kyron. Some experienced road testers claim it is a little on the rough side, others maintain that it soaks up the bumps yet remains able to cope with difficult terrain. Coil springs are fitted all round, which tend to control bumps a little better than some of the pickups and SUVs available in Thailand.

Off-road, the Kyron possesses an uncanny ability to deal with almost all situations, particularly when encountering steep hills, thanks to its hill-descent control (HDC). In addition, stability control is standard, as is antirollover protection.

Ventilated disc brakes are fitted at the front along with ABS and brake assist, which automatically increases braking pressure in emergencies. Somewhat condescendingly, Ssangyong's website says, "Women and elderly male drivers may be unable to exert sufficient braking force in emergencies. The BAS will detect the need for more braking power." The truth of the matter is that most drivers do not brake sufficiently hard in these situations and brake assist, in conjunction with the ABS, considerably reduces stopping distances.

Other safety features include dual airbags, side airbags for front occupants, a highmounted stop lamp and fog lamps front and rear. Automatic climate control is fitted, while a single-disc CD player is standard; a five-disc autochanger optional.

The second row of seats folds in a 60:40 split to increase versatility, while the rearmost seats fold almost flat. Luggage capacity is 1,085 liters, including - with seats folded - a length of over one meter, which is useful for conveying bulky items.

The towing ability is also impressive, with a maximum capacity of 2,300 kilograms.

While the Kyron may use obsolete Mercedes-Benz technology, it is a well-built and reliable SUV that owes a lot to its illustrious heritage. The Koreans - and the Chinese, too - are frequently thought of as "thirdworld" automakers, but they provide solid, no-nonsense vehicles at affordable prices.

# Eight-limbed yoga trains body

shtanga yoga is taught by Sri K Pattabhi Jois at the Ashtanga Yoga Research Institute in Mysore, India. This method of yoga involves synchronizing the breath with a progressive series of postures, a process that produces intense internal heat and profuse perspiration, purifying the body as toxins are carried away from the muscles and organs. This results in improved circulation, a light and strong body, and a calm

Swedish yoga-instructor Jonas Radahl teaches Ashtangayoga classes at Sukko Spa in Phuket. Jonas first became interested in yoga almost 10 years ago.

In 1999, he traveled to India to train in the ways of Ashtanga, although not under Sri K Pattabhi. Jonas continued to practice his newfound yoga techniques in Canada, where he completed a yoga teacher-training

Although Jonas says he is still a long way from attaining the harmony between the body and mind that Ashtanga practitioners aim for, his dedication to perfecting Ashtanga allows him to guide novices in taking their first steps on the Ashtanga path to personal development.

Jonas was the head yoga

instructor at Mandarin Oriental spa in Hong Kong before he came to Thailand. He believes that food and yoga are the fundamental ingredients to a healthy, happy and productive life.

"To the uninitiated, yoga is often misunderstood as an activity that only focuses on suppleness and the ability to stretch and bend the body to bizarre angles, but Ashtanga yoga not only keeps you physically fit, it also has a host of mental and spiritual benefits," said Jonas.

Jonas explained that "Ashtanga" means "eightlimbed", referring to the eight disciplines of Ashtanga voga:

- 1. *Yama*: moral discipline 2. Niyama: self-restraint, self-
- purification
- 3. Asana: posture
- 4. Pranayama: breath control 5. Pratyahara: sensory inhibition or sense control
- 6. *Dharana*: concentration
- 7. *Dhyana*: meditation
- 8. *Samadhi*: contemplation

The first four disciplines are

practices, while the remaining four are considered as internalcleansing disciplines that focus on spiritual development. "The postures and mindfulness of Ashtanga yoga are performed in a sequence that brings

considered physical-cleansing

them together in the correct order. It is important that the 'flow' of these postures is done under the guidance of a qualified teacher. Done correctly, the exercises will not only strengthen and purify the body, but they will


also lead to a clear and calm mind," Jonas explained.

"I've been teaching professionally for five years and I feel very fortunate that in that time I have been able to introduce a large number of people to the joys of yoga. Ashtanga yoga is like a form of moving meditation that helps focus the mind," he said.

"Because yoga is such an ancient practice, there are so many branches of it. Ashtanga yoga is like one branch or root of the yoga tree. Ashtanga yoga is a branch of Hattha yoga, which focuses only on physical postures. Wherever you go in the world, though, Ashtanga yoga will always be performed in the same way," he added.

Jonas explained that attaining the peak of spiritual development from practicing Ashtanga yoga is a lifetime commitment. Ashtanga practitioners aim to perfect a series of postures that are developed in six stages.

"When one series of postures is complete, the time is right to go on to the next one. As the practitioner progresses through the steps, the postures become harder. The first series may take up to a year to accomplish, the second can take up to two years and completion of the third series may take as long as 10 years to become fully proficient, so accomplishing all six steps is a pro-

cess that can take a lifetime to complete," he said.

"I encourage everyone who has a desire to perform a rewarding physical activity to practice Ashtanga yoga. It is mentally stimulating and it tunes the body by giving it a good physical workout," Jonas added.

"Attaining the correct posture in yoga is very important and it is for this reason that yoga is practiced with an instructor who can give advice and make corrections as the need arises. Performing yoga incorrectly by forming the wrong posture can lead to problems with the knees, back or breathing," he said.

"There are so many benefits to be gained from regular Ashtanga practice. The most immediate benefit is increased physical wellbeing, manifesting as a happy disposition. The body becomes stronger, better aligned and more flexible, which also energizes the body," Jonas explained.

The Ashtanga-yoga classes at Sukko Spa are called Mysore classes, named after the city in southern India where the world-renowned yoga guru Sri K Pattabhi Jois teaches.

"The teaching at Sukko Spa is unique in that students are taught on a one-on-one basis, allowing them their own space and to be guided by the teacher when necessary. The peaceful environment also allows students to easily tune into their breathing, the vehicle by which the body and mind are observed and eventually transcended," said Jonas.

"I incorporate a lot of other forms into my Ashtanga postures and vary the way I teach too, because it requires a lot of dedication from the students to learn and the students all have to do the same poses, so I make it easy and more fun for people to stay focused and feel challenged.

"The focus of these classes is for spiritual and bodily alignment by combining breathing techniques with the postures in a way that everyone finds easy to learn," Jonas said.

# t is easy to become disenchanted with the way many Thai doctors practice Western medicine. In the West, the standard line of the uninspired practitioner is, "Take two aspirin and call me in the morning."

In Phuket, it would more likely be, "I am not exactly sure what's wrong with you, but take these five bags of pills and syrups and then these pills...and then these. And if that doesn't work, check in to one of our fine international hospitals for a complete series of tests."

Is it any wonder so many people skip the consultation and go straight to the drug

store?

For those seeking a more holistic approach to health, a trip to the luxurious Angsana Spa at the Allamanda Resort at Laguna Phuket might be just what the doctor ordered.

At most spas in Phuket, the emphasis is on relaxation. While stress relief has well-known therapeutic effects, it is far from an all-encompassing approach to maintaining sound health.

The Angsana Spa in January introduced several Ayurveda therapies, all part of a holistic healing system that has been passed down from generation to generation in India for 5,000 years.

Treatment starts with a consultation – part of which is known as a dosha analysis – with Dr Arun Sateeth.

A fourth-generation Ayurvedic healer from Kerala, Dr Arun also has a master's degree in *yoga shirmani* and is a qualified Ayurvedic surgeon, though invasive practices such as bloodletting are not part of the current spa menu.

New to Ayruveda, my wife Piya and I filled out our questionnaires to determine where we fall in the *tridosha* system. At the heart of Ayuvedic theory is the

concept of three doshas, or fundamental bodily humors: *vatta*, *pitta* and *kapha*. Keeping the three in balance is the key to good health, we were told.

Filling out the questionnaire was both thought-provoking and fun, especially when done with a

life partner who knows you better than anyone else.

After reviewing my answers and examining my pulse, Dr Arun announced that I was a straight-up *kapha*, whereas my wife Piya had doshic qualities of

both vatta and pitta.

Saying he would analyze our questionnaires, Dr Arun then introduced us to our therapists, Lijo and Suma.

Wed eight months ago, they met while studying Ayurvedic medicine in Kerala, which is recognized as the center of Ayurvedic learning.

We were led to our spa pavilion, which was clean and comfortable.

Unlike many spa treatments, Ayurvedic therapies are "same sex", meaning that Lijo would be administering my therapy, while his wife treated mine

Our treatment was the 210minute Nirvana Package, one of eight *tridosha* packages on offer

After a small lamp was lit and a prayer said, the treatment started with a shampoo and head massage with a coconut-based *dhrebhala* oil.

Next was a foot massage in a large basin of water medicated with sandalwood, turmeric

and ramacham powders.

Then my treatment varied slightly from the standard package. I was given a full-body Katee Vasti massage with warm medicated oil. Intended to relieve back pain, this was a great deal more dynamic than any other oil massage I have received.

Next was a *podi kizhi* massage, which was administered using the Indian equivalent of a Thai *luk krob*: a hot compress filled with herbs. This was pounded firmly over my whole

body, making an interesting, almost hypnotic, plopping sound.

This had an immediate impact on me; I could feel and almost visualize the percussive effect freeing up toxins from tissues and loosening blockages.

Next was a full hour of *shirdohara*, a treatment I had long been waiting to try – and it did not disappoint. My eyes carefully covered, lukewarm herbal oil slowly flowed onto my forehead from a large circular basin suspended above my head.

The effect was that the center of my forehead felt like a melting patty of butter atop a stack of warm pancakes, with a thin, laminar flow of warm maple syrup slowly describing a continuously-changing pattern of loose circles, ovals and figure-eights upon it. I could see why *shirdohara* is used to treat insomnia, it is a relaxing and almost dream-inducing experience.

Next came a 30-minute scrub with sandalwood, herbal turmeric and ramacham, which left my skin tingling and sensitive. This was followed by a facial massage and herbal steam bath to get the pores completely open. The treatment concluded with a short shower and outdoor bath in cooling water medicated with fresh basil leaves.

After this, a red *bindhi* sticker was applied to the center of Piya's forehead and sandal-wood powder to mine.

Finally, we enjoyed a drink of cool ginger tea and fresh honey. For a light snack, we nibbled on fresh Concord grapes, the slightly-acidic sweetness of which was perfectly offset by the the smooth texture of diminutive *leb meu nang* bananas.

We were then led back to the main pavilion to get our prescriptions from Dr Arun. Mine included dietary tips, such as avoiding preserved foods.


I was also advised to give myself a monthly colonic cleansing using herbal laxatives and to perform the yogic Cobra posture regularly to keep my lower back muscles strong and aligned.

Best of all – and much to my wife's chagrin – I wasn't told I had to break my Heineken habit.

I left the Angsana Spa feeling clean, refreshed and determined to follow the advice of Dr Arun. It's too early to say if his tips will help me, but whenever possible, I prefer take my chances with 5,000-year-old natural remedies, rather than the latest offerings from the global pharmaceutical industry.

Jongerious and Rolien Beute are the perfect team aboard the 30-foot Firefly catamaran *The Frog*. Chris and Rolien have been running their sailing-charter business out of Ao Yon Bay for the past two years and their company, the Andaman Sea Club, has a fleet of three vessels.

"We are into the zoo thing," joked Chris, pointing out that the other two boats are named *The Elephant* and *The Horse*.

"Our dinghy is called *The Camel*. We had another one that was stolen called *The Worm*," said Rolien.

On a calm Sunday morning, a group of six joined the Dutch duo on *The Frog* for a day of sailing. Four in the group had never sailed before, and this outing would be on one of the fastest catamaran designs in the region. The Firefly was designed for local conditions by Mark Pescott and built on Phuket by Latitude 8° yachts.

Chris likes to have newcomers to sailing on his boat so that he can infect them with his sailing fever.

With the sun beating down and only a slight breeze, *The Frog* motored past the moored boats and out of Ao Yon Bay. Clearing the last anchored obstacle, Chris and Rolien raised the main sail and cut the motor. Each guest gazed across the water after finding a comfortable seat on pads strewn across the trampoline.

Chris delivered a sizingyou-up look and asked, "Have you ever sailed before?" After confirming his suspicions, he handed over the tiller and said, "Aim for that group of rocks straight ahead."

# Tutch nationals Chris Jongerious and Rolien Beute are the perfect Hopping around the bay



Screaming across the bay or just taking in the sights, Chris 'The Frog' Jongeriius simply loves sailing.

He then pushed a floppy straw hat over his beach-blond hair and lit up a cigarette. Chris, a wiry man in his fifties, explained that the small streamers on the sail, called tell-tails, determine whether to trim the sail or turn the boat. The group had been on board for only 10 minutes and already Chris was teaching them to sail.

An ex-cargo-plane pilot, Chris has always felt more at home on the water. "I think I was conceived on a boat or something like that," he joked. Chris and Rolien's charter business has provided the couple the chance to do what they love – daily.

Rolien, a long-time dive in-

structor and sailor who smiles continuously, passed around a tub of cookies.

With a light breeze that gradually grew stronger, *The Frog* picked up speed heading towards a green mound on the horizon – Koh Mai Thon. The triangular course from Ao Yon Bay to Koh Mai Thon to Koh Hei (Coral Island) and back is a typical itinerary for a day on *The Frog*, although a slew of other charter options are offered.

"We like it when people have their own ideas about where to go. It's great if they don't just want to go to Phi Phi or they don't want it all planned out for them. If they do want us to organize it, we do that, but it's not really necessary. We love to go exploring," said Rolien.

"The Frog doesn't have a draft – well, only 30 centimeters – so we can go to a lot more

places than other boats," Chris added.

When *The Frog* arrived at Koh Mai Thon, the passengers donned snorkels and hopped overboard. This land-

lubber reporter shamefully lost his within minutes.

After the swim, Rolien and Chris produced a Thai food lunch from the cabin and the hungry crew

dug in. A cry of "Look!" drew the adventurers' attention to dorsal fins slicing in and out of the water where a pod of bottlenose dolphins were tucking into their own lunch.

Chris fired up the small motor and put the boat on course to intercept the porpoises. The sleek, gray bodies torpedoed alongside the catamaran hulls for a short distance before disappearing back into the depths.

"Sailing in nature – that's what we offer," Chris later said.

The motor was cut and sails raised once more as *The Frog* headed to Koh Hei with another day tripper at the helm. After a second snorkeling session, this one in a secluded cove, Rolien let out the bright red spinnaker and the boat swiftly cut through the water back to Ao Yon Bay.

"I'm pretty sure that we offer one of the only boat trips that nearly always sails. When there's little wind, just like today, another boat would have motored – and that's the difference. There's nothing wrong with motoring – we did some motoring – but we switch it off very quick," Chris said.

"Chris being a sailor all his life and wanting very much to pass on his sailing skills is special. He loves to get people interested in sailing, to teach them about the life, about just using wind to get around," Rolien added.

The Andaman Sea Club offers a course for people who can

sail but lack skills in skippering a boat. Another option is for clients to put together a novice racing team, which the Dutch "Frogs" are happy to coach and, for a fee, provide their boat for

competitions.



# The story of the King's Cup

achting correspondent for the Bangkok Post Peter Cummins and Alan Parkhouse, former sports editor for *The Nation*, have provided an object lesson for people involved in the booming marine-leisure industry in Phuket: how a few guys hanging out in a yacht club hatched the regatta that would mushroom into Asia's biggest, best known and most fun.

A Sailing Legacy (Ensign Media, Bangkok, 2006, 99p) is the story of the Phuket King's Cup Regatta, which recently celebrated its 20th year during HM King Bhumibol Adulyadei's 80th birthday celebration. The first was held in 1987 to celebrate his 60th.

The book is a lavish production with gold-leaf dividers, silk page marker and photos, both historic and recent, by such nautical photographers as Guy Nowell, John Everingham and Rick Tomlinson.

As ML Tridhosyuth Devakul mentions in his foreword, he had a place on Nai Harn Beach called the Phuket Yacht Club Hotel, but with no yachts. "What better way to launch the hotel than to organize a regatta," he writes.

"The inaugural Phuket King's Cup Regatta was founded in 1987 by Royal Varuna sailors including Commodore Chris King, Dr Rachot Kanjanawanit, Al Chan-



dler, Adolph Knees and others," Cummins writes.

The original fleet was a motley collection of small craft - catamarans, Lasers and windsurfers, the stuff of the Royal Varuna Yacht Club – and a few keelboats. Thus you have an incident like: "Varuna member Reg Chambers, who sailed a Laser, called 'starboard' on a 45-ft keelboat, which had to give way."

Hobie Cat sailors would fly on the 26 mile course to Koh Phi Phi in 30-knot winds. The only priority then was to stay

In 1984, the race was limited to keelboats and the fleet has since mushroomed to over 100 vessels today. You can chart the world's economic development by the crews that arrive every year in middle of the road, as they looked for a Phuket. With a few Thai pioneers, the original crews were mostly made up of expat British, Aussies, New Zealanders and Americans. They were soon joined by crews from Singapore, Hong Kong and the Philippines – and now, more recently, from Russia and China.

The origins of the King's Cup began with the King's keen interest in building and sailing boats.

He and his children were intensely involved in the development of the Royal Varuna Yacht club, whose members are prominent in organizing the King's Cup

The Royal Varuna Yacht Club in turn was the brainchild of Walter Meyer. In April 1957, he placed an advertisement in the Bangkok Post that read:

"Boating friends needed to form a boat club." Among those who answered was Prince Bhisadej Rajani, who had taken up sailing at Cambridge University in the mid-1940s.

"Mayer and his friends drove up and down a little fishing village called Pattaya, which comprised about 20 fishermen's families and featured a big tree in the

place to set up their club...

"The journey from Bangkok in those days was a marathon drive of up to six hours, with a car ferry across the Bang Prakong River. Club members took their weekend supplies, plus charcoal burners and other essentials like cold beer, thought necessary for survival."

Alan Parkhouse covered his first Phuket King's Cup Regatta in 1991. Though working for a rival paper, Peter Cummins took Parkhouse under his wing and introduced him to many of the skip-

"On the third day of the regatta we sat down, wrote our stories and finished at the same time," Parkhouse writes.

'Each story was two or three foolscap pages long and we had the secretary in the media room fax them to our Bangkok offices every night."

The next day, Cummins was reading his story in the Bangkok Post and didn't recognize a word. "What have they done to my story?" he cried, slamming the paper down. "I didn't write this."

He didn't. Parkhouse did. The secretary had mixed up their dispatches.

'Neither of us ever mentioned the mishap in our respective offices," Parkhouse concludes.

plained that the price of the construction had increased rapidly and he had had to take on work at another site to cover his losses.

Mr A agreed to make another advance payment to the contractor, as the work was still in order and Mr A was eager for the project to be completed. Also, many of the construction staff were living at the site and there were a lot of construction materials and machines stored there.



The staff used the materials and machinery that their original employer had left behind. Mr A took care of quality control and management at the site.

At the end of the saga, Mr A ended up with his dream house and actually paid less than the contract had stated, although he likely ended up with a few more gray hairs on his head for his troubles.

After completion of the project, Mr A was satisfied and decided not to take the case to court as it could take years for a court decision that would be useless if the contractor still had no assets.

# Smoking ban enforcement all hot air?

The latest move to enforce no-smoking zones throughout Thailand made news worldwide, with foreign media praising Thailand for taking the kind of tough measures that many Western governments have shied away from.

Unfortunately, the law so far is vague to say the least. The only information currently available is a notice posted on the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) website (see news, page 2).

Also, at the time of going to press the smoking ban had already come into effect in Bangkok, but top officers from the Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) were at a MoPH seminar in Surat Thani to learn more about it.

While being very clear about some areas where smoking is banned, the notice says that air-conditioned venues are allowed to set up smoking zones.

What it does not do, however, is define what constitutes a smoking zone. It is currently possible for an air-conditioned nightclub to declare itself as compliant with the law but have designated smoking areas throughout the entire venue - rendering the new law useless.

The entertainment industry has already shown that it is willing to exploit legal loopholes to keep its customers happy. The Smoking Ban Act 2002 included "air-conditioned places selling food and beverages".

This was later interpreted to mean only restaurants, thus leading many restaurants on the island to change their licenses from restaurants to entertainment venues - leaving them unaffected by the

After high-profile inspection of a few public venues, the PPHO's enforcement of the smoking ban quickly tapered off, leaving the island to get on with business as usual.

Whether a repeat performance will ensue in 2008 remains to be seen. Just like last time, the MoPH is sounding off strong, but a hard line on smoking is likely to spark a strong reaction by entertain-

People have a right to smoke – and a right not to. Common sense and consideration is the only road to a happy medium. Such common sense is being applied with the investigation into complaints about seaplanes landing in Patong Bay (see news). In handling that issue, government officers led by no less than a vice-governor are seeing the effects first-hand and reacting appropriately.

Let's see if other island authorities can follow suit.

# Phuket playing catch-up

he purpose of my visit to Spain and Portugal in January was to gain in sight into how marinas, deep-sea ports and health spas are operated there.

The Portuguese have a long tradition of marine transportation and development, and they are especially experienced in marine management, both in the government and private sectors.

There is an impressive and orderly system of marine management in Portugal with many privately-built luxury marinas. These marinas attract high-end dining, shopping and entertainment establishments, which in turn attract wealthy customers and consumers.

Compared to this, Phuket's marine development still has a long way to go.

For Phuket to compete at this level we need support from the central government, such as with tax breaks and the establishment of a free-port zone, as well as the development of more facilities and infrastructure.

We have to develop all of these areas before we can promote marinas in Phuket as being on a par with those in Spain and Portugal.

The marinas in Phuket are comparatively small and we still need to overcome problems that prevent large yachts from docking here.

Our marinas currently operate to a schedule dictated by the moon and the tides, whereas the marinas in Spain can support

mega-yachts all the time. Phuket is also limited in the kind of marine transportation that is able to dock here due to the impact it may have on the environment.

I don't mean to imply that the government has to support marine development by the private sector, but we need to evaluate each of the potential problems we will have to overcome in order to build marinas to international standards.

Comparing Thailand's spa

industry to Portugal's and Spain's, I'm pleased to say that we beat them hands down.

The level of skills and service in their spa industries cannot compete with that of Thailand's spa therapists.

I met the new Director of Phuket International Airport [PIA] Wing Commander Wicha Nernlop on February 5 to discuss current issues, especially the problems surrounding the limousine concession, which have not yet been resolved.

There are so many issues to consider that I cannot comment on them much at the moment, but I did ask that the opinion of the Phuket Provincial Office be considered before a final decision is reached on new contracts and concessions or any other changes of that nature.

It is unfair that other people or tourists who know nothing of the issues are affected by the airport being blocked by protesters,

so any protests or demands should be made through the appropriate channels, instead of by actions that disrupt others.

If they block the road or the airport entrance again, we will arrest them and they will be recorded on video as evidence.

I ask that PIA please consult further with the Phuket Provincial Office regarding limousine concessions and that everybody thinks of how their actions will affect the general public, instead of only thinking in terms of their own benefits.

Regarding plans to build a new airport in Phang Nga, I think we have to carefully consider the worth of such a project.

We have to scrutinize international aviation standards as to how many kilometers apart two airports should be, as Phuket and Phang Nga provinces are next to each other.

If every province were to have its own airport, it would be a huge investment and I think we would soon see airports shutting

We have to consider how we expect the government to support such development as we are not a rich country.

We must consider whether there would be enough aircraft landing at the additional airports and what kind of planes a new airport could handle.

We will be present at the ITB Roadshow to be held in Berlin again in March. This is the largest tourism road show in the world.

Our economy benefited from tourism as a result of the event last year, so we intend to continue attending road shows in many countries.

This year and next year are specified as tourism years by the central government. Despite the economy not being in great shape last year, Phuket benefited greatly from tourism.

Increased international interest in the Phuket property market has seen many wealthy investors buy property in Phuket. The island is a big hit now with resort developers.

I have heard that interest from the Phuket property market will be more beneficial than leaving money in the bank to gain interest.

Compare the trend now to just after the 2004 tsunami when hotel owners wanted to sell but could not find investors.

We need to ensure investors continue to be interested by making sure that they have a stable environment to invest in and that the tsunami-warning system is properly maintained.

I have heard that new smart cards will replace driving licenses. Is this true? If so, how are they different to the old ones and when will they be available

Also, if I already have a current driving license, can I change it for the "smart card" type?

### Chatchawarn Ngarmtup, chief of Phuket Provincial port Office replies:

The new smart card will be made available at provincial transport offices throughout all 14 southern provinces from March

In addition, the new driving licenses will be accepted as valid in Brunei, Burma, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore and

The new licenses are designed to last longer than the cur-

Details on the card will be in both Thai and English and the card will have a magnetic strip containing the holder's personal details.

If you already have a driving license and want to change for the new smart card, you can apply for one at your local trans-

When you apply, please also present proof of your address (the same as indicated on your driving license), such as a copy of your house registration certificate (tabien baan) or a letter from Immigration confirming your ad-

The fee charged will depend on the type of license being re-issued.

For example, a one-year motorbike driver's license costs 55 baht and a one-year car driver's license costs 105 baht, while a five-year motorbike driver's license costs 255 baht and a five-year car driver's license costs 505 baht.

Whatever the fee is, it will cost an extra 100 baht to have the license issued as a smart

# n my previous column I talked about the abysmal state of international Internet access in Phuket. As best I can tell, after looking at historic real-time user logs, Phuket experienced a massive meltdown in Internet access speeds on or about December 14, 2007. Somebody, somewhere changed something, and the result has been devastating for everyone in Phuket who relies on the Internet to get any work done.

As shown by the accompanying graph, Internet services sold to customers as "2 Mbps" connections deliver less than onetenth the advertised speed, internationally, in the afternoons and evenings.

Both TOT and TT&T ADSL lines frequently dip below old-fashioned dial-up modem speeds.

Henry Habermacher, a Microsoft MVP and Access expert, who's affiliated with X-NET Computer Peripherals Supply in Phuket, has come up with a dynamite website that lets people all over Phuket log their international Internet speeds.

Drop by www.live-access.com/PhuketInternet.aspx and see how folks all over the island are doing. You can look at the data, download it, work with it and get a feel for the various products. At this point, as you can see in the chart, it isn't a pretty sight.

For consistency, we all use one specific speed test – the ADSLReports.com Java-based test – to one specific site in the US. The results should give you a very good idea about real-world international Internet access from Phuket.



# Phuket's Internet meltdown continues



Are you paying for a 2 Mbps ADSL connection? This is what other people on the island are experiencing – and it's not a pretty sight.

About the graph, I was surprised to see that the CAT Hi-Net ADSL service, which used to be quite fast, doesn't recover until well after midnight. As long as you work between 1 am and 9 am, the CAT line can keep up. After 11 am, forget it.

The winner overall is CAT's EV-DO "AirCard" service. If you want reliable, relatively quick Internet service, don't use an ADSL line. Go to the CAT office (on Phang Nga Rd in Phuket City) and buy a DO card.

You can buy AirCards many places in Phuket, but the only ones that work with the fast Internet service are the ones sold at CAT. I've talked about the EV-DO service in these pages many times before. For a quick overview, go to www.phuket gazette.com/computers/index.asp and click on the link marked "Fast wireless Internet is back."

The EV-DO speeds are so good – and they stay good throughout the day – that I would be willing to bet EV-DO customers are routed dif-

ferently to the rest of the world than the rest of

Perhaps CONI.

CAT Hi-Net, TOT and TT&T customers hit the Bangkok-Bangrak roadblock, while EV-DO customers get out of Thailand via a different line.

I'll be following up on that intriguing possibility in future columns.

Some people wonder why I'm so insistent on measuring international speeds instead of Internet speeds to Bangkok.

When the Thai phone companies report their connection speeds to the Thai government, they emphasize their in-country Internet access speeds.

When TOT issues press releases about installing 1 Gbps lines in Phuket, they're talking about 1 Gbps inside Thailand –

and it remains to be seen if there will be any significant attempt to improve access outside of

Thailand.

KHUN WOODY'S

Of course, in most cases, international access speeds are far more important than domestic speeds. Unless you spend most of your time online working on websites inside Thailand, the in-

ternational figures are far more important. But there's more to the story.

It may surprise you to learn that many of Thailand's large websites aren't located in Thailand. If you book a flight on THAI Airways, for example, you use the thaiairways.com server in Centennial, Colorado, in the US. The Bumrungrad Hospital website is hosted in Milton, Queensland, Australia.

The Bangkok Post website emanates from Denver, Colorado. Even the Tourism Authority of Thailand, tourismthailand.com, is hosted in Toronto, Canada.

Slow speeds connecting the rest of the world with Thailand-based websites suffer the same problem – but the other way around.

If you're outside Thailand and want to get on a web server inside Thailand, you're subjected to the same kind of degraded – and degrading – service we see in Phuket.

Is there any wonder why THAI Airways, for example, chooses to have its servers in the US?

### PHUKET: In a letter to the Australian Stock Exchange (ASX) dated February 4, Wotif.com Holdings Limited (Wotif) announced that it has entered into an agreement to acquire all of the issued shares in Asia Web Direct (HK) Limited.

Asia Web Direct (AWD) shareholders have agreed to a multi-million dollar sales price payable in a combination of cash and Wotif shares. Completion of the transaction is conditional upon satisfactory due diligence and is expected to occur before the end of next month.

The letter to the ASX stated that the AWD network attracts approximately 3 million visitors a month, and that in 2007 it achieved bookings of about 450,000 room nights. The letter also notes that AWD's business has shown "consistent growth both in revenues and profits over the last 5 years," and that its room inventory now comes from more than 4,000 hotels in Southeast Asia.

# The US struggles to avoid debt recession

his year promises to be difficult in many respects. Growth is slow ing in many major economies and recession may already be evident in the US and Japan. Europe is also finding itself slowing down.

One factor these economies share is rising inflation, with the main causes being higher commodity prices.

Food prices are rising. Never in the history of mankind have so many people in such a short period enjoyed such an increase in their standard of living. The booming economies of China, India, Vietnam and many other emerging countries are having a large impact on their average citizens' buying power. One of the first things that people spend their increased income on is food.

Also, many crops are being diverted for use as biofuels, making them unavailable as extra food supply. This is adding to pressure on prices to rise.

America is facing a series of problems. In the newer category is the housing mess and associated sub-prime shambles. Credit rating agency Standard & Poors recently estimated that, in addition to the US\$100 billion in already announced losses, there are at least another US\$265 billion still to be written off.

Many economists believe that this second round of losses will be from a much wider group, including regional US banks, American and foreign municipalities, and other investors, such as pension funds.

Commentators are placing the blame for this on the shoulders of the US central bank, the Federal Reserve. In particular, accusing former chairman Alan Greenspan of keeping interest rates too low for too long earlier this decade.

The "Fed" and Mr Greenspan may have kept interest rates too low and for too long, but this lenders to go on a spree.

The real reason for this financial fiasco was that America's lenders had no intention of retaining these loans on their balance sheets.

The idea was to sell as many loans as possible and to package them en masse and sell them to

other investors with different labels, such as a collateralized debt obligation (CDO) or structured-investment vehicle (SIV).

Then, it was a matter of caveat emptor ("Let the buyer beware"). The buyers of this debt were "blindsided" by high investment-grade credit ratings issued

by the major credit rating agencies, normally triple "A" or at least double "A".

This, in turn, made these "investment vehicles" legally allowable for inclusion in the holdings of pension funds and other large investors.

Now, with the spotlight on these "investment vehicles", the credit-rating agencies are rapidly placing them on review for credit-rating downgrades.

This leaves some serious legal problems. For example, most pension funds are allowed to invest in debt investments only if they are at least of investmentgrade quality. The credit downgrades are relabeling this "investment-grade debt" as "junk".

The only entities actually paying the fees levied by the credit-rating agencies are the issuers of this "paper" – that is, the banks and other lenders. This is leaving credit-rating agencies open to legal attack by those who stand to lose money.

was no excuse for America's panies that specialize in bond insurance, such as MBIA. These

> so large that the proposed Federal fiscal stimulus package of around US\$157 billion pales in comparison.

> Should all this come to pass, there

are still solutions. First, the US will have to accept more involvement from Sovereign Wealth Funds. Such help, however, even if foreign governments were prepared to entertain this proposition, would come with many strings attached.

Second, the US government can print money to cover the losses. This is highly inflationary, but it would not be the first time that a government has taken this route to reduce debt.

A third option would take a combination of these two sce-

The US has one advantage: its central bank. The US Fed is aware of the problems and its aggressive cutting of interest rates will assist the eventual recovery.



# Raging Bull lives the dream

n Cebu, Philippines, on February 2, a bout dubbed "Now or Never" saw the IBF super-flyweight eliminator between Filipino Z "The Dream" Gorres (27-2-2, 15 KOs) and Armenian Vic "The Raging Bull" Darchinyan (29-1-1, 23 KOs) to determine the challenger to IBF world champion Dimitri Kirilov. The bout ended in a draw, which caused turmoil and confusion.

Gorres, a southpaw, came out quickly, firing out jabs and preventing Darchinyan from gaining momentum. Later in the round, referee Lance Revill erroneously called a Gorres slip a knockdown, prompting a near-instantaneous salvo of plastic bottles and coins from the crowd. It was at this point that Revill, flustered by the rowdy Filipino crowd, seemed to lose control of the bout.

By round 10 it was clear that Darchinyan was the stronger of the two fighters. Gorres went to the canvas three times in the final four rounds, two of which may have been legitimate knockdowns missed by the referee. A fatigued Gorres managed to hang on to finish the bout, but then came the anti-climax: the decision.

Judge Jonathan Davis (PI) had it 114-112 for Darchinyan, judge Montol Suriyachand (TH) scored it for Gorres 113-112, while judge Cec Perkins (AU) cast a 113-113 score, rendering the bout a draw.

Darchinyan's promoter, Gary Shaw, stated that he will file a protest with the IBF. "The referee [Lance Revill] has never

done a world-title fight outside of New Zealand and I think the pressure of the hostile environment got to him. I think it also affected the Thai judge and the Australian judge. The Thai judge scored the 10th and 11th rounds for Gorres, which were very clearly Vic's rounds," he said.

Kirilov's mandatory title defense is due within 90 days. Due to the severity of his cut, Gorres will be unable to train for the bout, leaving Darchinyan to challenge for the title with the winner then facing Gorres.

In Jakarta, Indonesia, the World Boxing Concert mixed prizefights with dinner, dancing girls and Indonesia's top rock bands in an effort to bring something different to the boxing norm.

Despite the hoopla, there was no doubt as to what was the real draw: the WBA feather-weight-title fight between Indonesia's iconic champion Chris John and mandatory challenger Roinet Caballero of Panama.

Both fighters started the bout tentatively, with John feinting and Caballero in motion, occasionally lunging in and attempting to surprise John with a big shot.

By the end of the round, John was landing his jab and peppering Caballero with body shots, further fanning the flames of the Indonesian crowd.

Caballero picked up the pace in the next two rounds, but John was the sharper of the pair, bludgeoning the Panamanian with stiff jabs and counter rights. Caballero was game and came to fight, coming forward whenever John would allow it, landing sporadically, but, for the most part, ineffectively.

By the seventh round, John was in charge and Caballero had no defense against John's pinpoint punches. Like a wrecking ball bent on demolishing a resilient building, left hook after left hook crashed into the liver of Caballero and by the end of the round, it was clear the end was near.

Between rounds, referee Raul Caiz Jr looked in on Caballero to appraise his condition. Seconds later, just before the start of round eight, Caballero's corner admitted defeat and the bout was stopped.

John earned \$215,000 for defending his title, while Caballero received \$70,000. The victory moves the champion's record to 41-0-1, with 22 Kos, while the loser drops to 22-8-1, with 16 Kos.

Southeast Asia's boxing year has started with a bang with a couple of world-title fights and more to come throughout the region in the next two months.





# Young swimmers take on the Flying Fish

PHUKET: The Flying Fish Swim Club from British International School, Phuket, held their first Yanang Cup on February 9 with more than 100 swimmers from four clubs taking part.

Thirty BIS students were joined by 18 swimmers from Saphan Hin 1, who train at the Phuket City Municipality pool; 28 from Saphan Hin 2, who train at the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) pool; and 27 from the Phuket Andaman Swim Club.

Sixty-four races were held over 50 meters, 100m and 200m across five age groups: up to eight years old, nine to 10 years old, 11 to 12, 13 to 14, and 15 years and older.

BIS were the fastest team on the day, scoring 756 points, averaging 25.2 points per race. Saphan Hin 2 were second, with an average race score of 23, while Phuket Andaman Swim Club came third, scoring an average of 22.81 points per race.

Winners of each race were awarded 15 points for their respective teams, while second place picked up 13 points on a sliding scale down to one point for last place.

BIS swim coach Torwai "Oat" Sethasothorn said, "We wanted to get a group of swimmers in Phuket together to show their abilities. It was a good chance to to have Thai swimmers competing with foreign children. This will help make them want to race better swimmers."

The best local swimming talent was on hand, including BIS swim team captains Gavin Lewis and Karnnika Porter, who used the competition as a warm-up for the Thailand junior nationals in Ubon Rachathani in March.

Also in March, 20 Flying Fish will travel to Perth, Australia, to compete in the Indian Ocean Challenge, where swimmers from Australia, Asia and Africa will compete for the coveted team title won by the Asian team last year.





hould we ask questions? Is it really worth the effort? I'm sure we could save ourselves a lot of time by not bothering to ask them in the first place. In many cases, we know before opening our mouths that our inquiry will produce no logical response.

We certainly shouldn't ask the owners of certain vehicles why they feel the urge to attach little blue lights to their washer jets or blue fluorescent bulbs to the undersides of their cars.

I tend to ask too many questions. Why, under Thai law, is it illegal to buy a bottle of beer between 2 pm and 5 pm, yet if you want to buy 30 bottles, that's perfectly all right? Basically, if you fancy a quick beer, you can't, but if you intend to get exceptionally drunk, you can purchase as much beer as you want.


the beans inside are fruits. Tomatoes, cucumbers, watermelons and squash are fruits, too. Even the chili falls into this category.

The fruit side gets a bit complicated at times, as some fruits don't contain real seeds. For example, most varieties of banana don't contain seeds as we'd normally think of them and strawberries have their pathetic attempt at seeds on the outside.


So why are most fruits sweet? Just to encourage young boys to jump over walls and help themselves to the contents of orchards? Well, nearly. Most fruits are sweet because they contain a simple sugar called fructose, while most vegetables are less sweet because they have much less fructose. In nature, the sweetness of fruit encourages animals to eat it and then later distribute the seeds in the most natural way possible.





# Clearing starts for B1bn Chalong project

CHALONG: Work has begun on clearing 69 rai of rubber plantation opposite the Phuket Provincial Electricity Office substation on Chao Fa West Rd for the onebillion-baht The Beverly Hills project, which is being developed by AV Real Estate.

AV Real Estate Managing Director Vutiphan Wangprakobsuk told the Gazette that the project will be in five phases. Construction, to be carried out by Gold Future Co Ltd, is expected to start by the end of March.

The first phase will occupy

about six rai, including the frontage along Chao Fa West Rd. It will comprise 38 units that K. Vutiphan described as "modern home-office units", which will be housed in three, three-story blocks. Prices for these units

will start at 4.3 million baht.

look too much like other 'general commercial buildings'. We have designed them to match the modern Balinese resort style we have used throughout the entire project," K. Vutiphan said.

The remaining four phases will be developed in sequence, one behind the other, away from the main road and heading up Khao Noi hill.

Current plans for Phase 2 comprise 41 three-bedroom bungalows on plots averaging 240 square meters at prices starting at 4.2 million baht. This phase will be built on nine rai, although the number of houses in this phase

may vary, depending on whether phase is about 50% complete, he buyers want bigger plots, said K.

Phase 3 will comprise 25 bungalows on 300sqm plots at prices starting at 5.7 million baht and 30 two-story detached houses on 400sqm plots at prices starting at 7.5 million baht.

Phase 4 is set for 44 to 50 two-story detached houses with private pools and on plots averaging 600sqm. Prices for these units start at 12.7 million baht.

The final phase is set to be built on 11 rai atop Khao Noi. K.

Vutiphan explained that it will comprise a total of 15 oneand two-story detached houses, each with a private pool. Prices for Phase 5 units are expected to start at 15 million baht, he said.

ond phase is expected to be fin-"We have designed our ished around April 2009. I think home offices so that they do not we will have about 85% of Phases I and II complete by the end of this year. We now have about 200 construction workers on hand and need only about 85 workers for Phase I, the rest will work on Phase II," he said.

'We have cleared about 30% of the rubber trees, but we are not cutting down other big trees to make sure that the project has green areas."

Work on Phases 3, 4 and 5 are expected to start March next year after Phases I and II are complete, he said. The first four phases are expected to be complete by mid-2010. Work on the clubhouse will start after the third

"Work on Phase 5 will start after all the other phases are finished," K. Vutiphan said.

"We have set aside about one rai on the hilltop for a clubhouse that will have a fitness center, swimming pool, game room, kids' corner and a restaurant. From this elevation, we can see the old tin mine at [the] Chaofa City [site]," he added.

K. Vutiphan said that the development was well suited to the Phuket property market, where buyers have the capacity to buy high-quality homes. "Foreigners and Thais are coming to live and work here, so homes are very important. No-one wants to rent a house for the rest of their lives," he said.

"The project will offer good living to residents. Strips of land 20 meters wide have been set aside for the main roads within the development and areas 16 meters wide for the smaller roads.


"All power cables will be installed underground and free digital cable TV will be installed in every home," he said.


K. Vutiphan explained that the project was not related to the Beverly Hills development in Patong, which was caught up in a landslide last September.

# Light up your life to transform your home

hoosing the right light ing throughout your home can make or break each room's ambiance and appeal.

Lighting specialist and owner of Phuket Lamp Jakrapon "Duke" Wichan offers consultancy, design and installation of lighting for homes and offices – and he had a few ideas to share with the Gazette about how to get your shine on at home.

When considering lighting concepts, you ought to think of the tone of a room, taking into consideration where the lighting will go, because the tone of light will dictate a room's ambiance, said K. Duke.

Warm tones, such as ivory,

oranges and reds, are arousing and refreshing. They make a room cozy and can put you in a good mood, he said.

In contrast, cool tones, such as blues and greens, will give a room a light, plain look, but these colors can soften corners and hard edges Use these tones to create a feeling of openness that conveys a sense of freedom, he added.

Mixing warm and cool colors in the same room is a bad idea, according to K. Duke. It makes a room look plain and lacking in person-

When choosing decorative lighting for

bedrooms, consider the function years. of the lighting you're going to reach from your bed. Soft, warm tones can instill feelings of relaxation in a bedroom, explained K. Duke.

In any living area, an unobstructed soft light source next to a television set will prevent eyes from straining while watching television in the dark, he

Lighting in a kitchen is not just for cooking, but to light up other surfaces.

If you only have downlights in a kitchen, they will cast shadows over counter tops.

Lighting should be installed

to light up a kitchen's counter, sink and cooking areas, he suggested.

When installing lights in a bathroom, ensure that there is some kind of ventilation so that circuitry will not be affected by dampness.

Suitable lights for a bathroom include halogen downlights, which create a soft atmosphere.

Too many lamps in a bathroom will raise the temperature and give a room a harsh look, he warned.

LED lamps are the latest trend in lighting. They are versatile and energy efficient, with a lifespan of between 10 and 15



LED lighting works well in use. For example, controls for a home to decorate a bar counter reading lamps should be easy to or light up a home theater, he said.
