# Disgraced police sentenced over Ko Noi murder

PHUKET: Two former police officers on February 28 were sentenced at Phuket Provincial Court for their part in the assassination of well-known businessman Preecha "Ko Noi" Kraitas, who was shot dead on March 14, 2006.

According to a report released by Phuket Provincial Court, Wanchana Polpalangkul, who pleaded not guilty to all charges, was sentenced to death for conspiracy to murder for organizing the hit.

Pongsak Kosiratanapibal, who pleaded guilty to all charges, was sentenced to life imprisonment for accessory to murder for identifying K. Preecha to gunman Samrerng Klaising.

Petchaburi native Samrerng was arrested at a wedding in Petchaburi's Baan Laem District March 9, 2007, only to disappear and remain at large after being granted bail.

K. Preecha, who owned Fisherman's Way housing estate and Phuket Shooting Range in Rawai, was driving his Jeep Cherokee along Wiset Rd with his wife and nine-year-old son at about 11 pm when Samrerng and a driver pulled up alongside them in a red sedan.

Samrerng opened fire and hit K. Preecha twice in the head with two 9mm bullets.

K. Preecha's vehicle collided with a minivan, then careened off the road, scraped along a wall and crashed into a tree.

K. Preecha died the following day at Phuket Interna-

tional Hospital. His wife and son escaped without serious injury.

The driver of the sedan has never been identified.

In March 2006, police said they believe Samrerng and the driver were hiding in Central Thailand.

Wanchana and Pongsak, who were formerly attached to the Phuket Elite Special Operations Unit, were arrested March 18, 2006, by a team of police led by the deputy chief of the Bangkok-based Central Investigations Division.

Pongsak, who allegedly cracked after more than four

hours of questioning by police, confessed to having pointed out the target to Samrerng before the attack.

Wanchana and Pongsak were released on bail and suspended from duty pending trial.

Police initially said they thought the motive for killing may have been related to a business deal, although there has since been no confirmation of this by police.

Jurairat Kraitas, K. Preecha's wife, 37, declined to comment, citing that the case must now go through the Courts of Appeal.

# 7-baht wage hike had 'no effect' – Labor chief

PHUKET: The seven-baht increase in the minimum wage in Phuket to 193 baht a day, which came into effect on January 1, has not negatively affected businesses on the island, Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima announced on March 10.

Before the rise from 186 to 193 baht, bestowing Phuket with the second-most-expensive minimum daily wage rate in the country – and just a baht below the daily rate in Bangkok – concerns had been expressed that the move could be a threat to the survival of small businesses in Phuket.

"We have found that the increase has not affected Phuket's economy at all," Suthipong Saiskarej, director of the Phuket Provincial Labor Office, said.

"Phuket's economy depends mainly on tourism, and people in the hospitality industry are generally paid above the minimum wage anyway, so they have not been affected by the move," K. Suthipong explained.

It is believed that Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit aims to have the minimum wage in Phuket raised by another seven baht before the end of the year.

"If the economy continues to grow at its current rate, it is possible that raising the minimum wage even further will be considered, although it's not something that will happen right now," K. Suthipong said.

"There are many factors to be considered before we can increase the minimum wage again," he added.

#### 4 charged in ya bah busts

PHUKET CITY: About 6:30 pm on March 6 police arrested Thanat "Ped" Soithong with 10 *ya bah* (methamphetamine) pills at the home of 23-year-old Chamaiphon "Ann" Kanrit on Luang Por Chuon Rd Soi 5.

Police had earlier arrested Ann for possession and sale of *ya bah* at the nearby Jatujak Market. She confessed to the charges, police said, saying she bought the pills from Ped at 380 baht each and resold them at 500 baht each.

Police later arrested Ped, 30, from Bangkok, outside Ann's home. Under questioning, he told police that he had 550 more pills at his home on Phuket Rd, police said.

Ann and Ped were denied bail and were being held at Phuket Provincial Prison.

Also busted on March 6, were Kathawut "Boy" Wimutisuk and Apichat "Cha" Channam, both 22. The Thalang men were arrested after selling six *ya bah* pills to undercover police about 11:30 pm near the Laem Hin turnoff on Thepkrasattri Rd in Koh Kaew.

#### Drug dealer avoids capture

KATHU: Kathu Police failed to snare a drug dealer from Chiang Mai known as "Suphawat" on March 3.

Pol Lt Col Nitikorn Rawang said that police had arrested Nattawut Kachinrat, 21, from Trang, and two 16-year-old males sitting in front of a house on Phra Barami Soi 1 at 2:45 am after finding them in possession of 46 *ya bah* (methamphetamine) pills.

The three men said that they had bought the drugs from Krissada Yakiti, 19. Police arrested Krissada the same day, charging him with possession of 10 *ya bah* pills. Krissada told police his supplier was "Suphawat" from Chiang Mai and helped police organize a sting operation, arranging to pick up *ya bah* pills on Thaweewong Rd.

When police moved in to catch Suphawat, they found a locked suitcase with the drugs inside, but Suphawat had already fled.

#### Forest blazes in Karon hills

KARON: On March 7 at dusk, Karon Municipality firefighters were called in to fight a forest fire in the Nakkerd Hills, upslope from the desalination plant on Siriraj Rd.

Firefighters tried to gain access to the blaze for two hours before giving up.

Fortunately, the fire burned itself out during the night. No injuries or property damage were reported.

PHUKET: In order to continue its work on high-voltage power lines, the Phuket Provincial Electricity Authority (PPEA) has announced scheduled blackouts that will affect major business areas as follows:

March 18, from 9 am to 4 pm. Phuket City: the west side of Thepkrasattri Rd, from the PPEA substation to Phuket Wittayalai School, including Soi Lakgongsri, Prompan Village, Soi Manoon U-Thit 1 and 2, Soi Hongbut, Soi Rassada-ramruk, Moo Baan Phuket Garden View, Komaraphat Rd and Moo Baan Rabaroon as well as the soi from the Wor Kor Intersection to Phuket Rajabhat University and Soi Rajabhat-Samkong.

March 19, from 9 am to 5 pm Chalong: the east side of Chao Fa West Rd, from opposite the PPEA substation to Chalong Circle, including Soi Nayai, sections of Land & Houses Park, Luang Por Chaem Rd, Soi Pramote, Soi Thanuthep and Moo Baan Chalong Suk.

## Runaway bus slams into house in Patong

PHUKET: Two people died and many more were injured after a truck overturned in Kamala on March 10 and a tour bus slammed into a house in Patong around 6:30 pm the day before.

The brakes on a Nareuporn Tour bus failed as it was entering Patong. The bus plowed into a sedan car in front of it and into an abandoned house opposite Wat Patong.

At least one person has been confirmed dead and at least 15 others injured, including one victim who will have a leg amputated

Patong resident Simon Rooke of England said, "There was glass everywhere, people everywhere and a coach half on the road and half in the housing plot.

"Had it been a weekday, it would have been much worse," he said

About 9 am the next day, a 10-wheeled truck carrying mattresses from Bangkok to Phuket overturned on a hill in front of the Kamala Falls condo project site.

One of the two passengers

who were asleep in the cab at the time died in the accident. Identified only as "Yantra", the man was pinned under the wreckage and died at the scene.

The other passenger, identified only as "Yeesa", was rushed to Patong Hospital for treatment. He was seriously injured but still conscious, Lt Col Warit said.

The driver, Wangsen Yeemeng, 35, escaped with only minor injuries. He will be fined with

negligent driving resulting in death, Lt Col Warit added.

Wangsen told the *Gazette* that he and the other two men had just arrived in Phuket from Bangkok, having spent the night before in Tab Phut district, in Phang Nga.

"I tried to wake my friends up before the accident happened, but they kept sleeping. After the truck overturned, I first had to find a way out of the wreckage," he said.

# Shops warned over trading stolen goods

PHUKET CITY: Secondhandgoods shops found trading or in possession of stolen goods may soon face legal action. Phuket Provincial Chief Administrative Officer (Palad) Piya Bharatasilpin warned at a special meeting convened to tackle the issue on Tuesday.

"This is a problem in many provinces, not just Phuket. Thieves often sell stolen property to secondhand-goods stores for

We need government officers and police to work together and check these shops to make sure they follow the law," K. Piya

He added that in recent months many shops in Phuket have been found with stolen property on their premises.

"There are more than 200 registered secondhand-goods stores in Phuket and many still buy stolen government property, such as copper cable and water meters, the same things you read about in the news," K. Piya said.

"We need to force secondhand-goods store owners to stop accepting these kinds of goods and charge them where necescharge them if they continue to ignore the law," he added.

#### Tuk-tuk driver drunk, shot and still missing

PHUKET CITY: Police have yet to hear back from a tuk-tuk driver who appeared at Phuket City Police Station early March 10 morning drunk and bleeding from an apparent gunshot wound – and told to come back later.

Pol Lt Saran Redeng, duty officer at Phuket City Police Station, said that Somkid Huangsrapram, 42, arrived at the station about 2:50 am complaining that he had been shot by a gang of about six youths on motorcycles as he was driving past Central Festival, Lt Saran said.

The front windshield of his tuk-tuk was shattered and missing most of the glass on the driver's side.

K. Somkid, a resident of Rawai, said he was on his way home from the Larb Udon Isarn restaurant, on Bangyai Rd behind Big C, when his progress was slowed by the motorcycle gang, who were riding slowly three abreast, Lt Saran said.

The gang comprised six

males and one female. When he shouted at them to move, one of the gang shot at him, he added.

However, Lt Saran said that K. Somkid was too drunk to file an official statement and that his account was given only ver-

K. Somkid was told to go to a hospital for treatment to a minor wound to his arm that was still bleeding, Lt Saran said.

"I told him to get treatment at a hospital for the wound to his arm, which appeared to have been scratched or grazed. He was too drunk to make a statement.

"However, he never came back to make a report or file a complaint. In fact, I'm not even sure whether he went to a hospital," he said.

"I think he had a problem with that gang, but as he never filed a report we have no complaint on which to act," Lt Saran added.

K. Somkid was unable to give a description of any of the gang members, he said.

#### Three Brits still in Phuket Prison


PHUKET CITY: Phuket Provincial Court has denied bail to a British family charged with bank fraud after they were caught using counterfeit cards to withdraw more than 100,000 baht from a Kasikorn Bank ATM in downtown Phuket City.

Lt Col Chakaphol Suchon of Phuket City Police Station told the Gazette that the three suspects are still being held at Phuket Provincial Prison awaiting their next court appearance.

Mark Hubert Veerasawmy, 44, his son Sonny, 19, and Jennifer Anne Chapman, 31, were arrested on February 18 after an alert citizen notified police that the father and son were behaving strangely.

The three have refused to give any details about how they obtained the fake bank cards, except to say that they bought them off a man named "Peter", Lt Col Chakaphol said. Finding the elder Mr Veerasawmy's testimony unconvincing, investigators will continue to seek further evidence in the case, he added.

"Their request for bail was denied by the court, which cited the possibility that they would flee the country if released," Lt Col Chakaphol said.





# ot long after PM Samak stated his intention of legalizing casinos as a way of attracting more foreign tourists and generating additional government revenue, Assumption University's ABAC Poll conducted a study on 2,726 people in 18 provinces [See Around The Nation, page 7] on the issue.

The results revealed that 56.4% of respondents opposed the idea, while just 31.9% of respondents supported it, the rest were unsure.

Several years ago, when a similar idea was put forward during the first Thakisn Administration, the Phuket Chamber of Commerce (PCC) conducted a similar poll among business leaders, government officials and other selected individuals here in Phuket with a similar result.

Yet despite the opposition, over 55% of those surveyed in the recent ABAC poll said they thought of gambling as a "normal thing", while 35% admitted they had gambled before.

These figures reveal the sense of squeamishness that exists in Thai society over legalizing a vice that is against the teachings of both Buddhism and Islam.

Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Col Paween Pongsirin told the *Gazette* that he favors the idea, because police officers are fed up playing catand-mouse games with people who set up illegal gambling operations on the island.

"We are very bored with it, but gambling is against the law so we must enforce it we can't ignore our duty. For this reason, I personally agree with legalizing casinos," he told the *Gazette* in his busy office on March 6.

"The key issue, however, is how we regulate casino activities and screen the people we allow to enter," he said.

"My main reason for wanting to legalize casinos is the presence of so many underground gambling syndicates all around

## Casinos in Phuket?

n his Sunday morning talk show on March 3, Prime Minister Samak Sundaravej told listeners he would work towards legalizing certain forms of gambling by the end of his four-year term as Prime Minister should he make it that far. Interior Minister Chalerm Yubamrung was quick to support the idea, which soon became the hottest news issue in Thailand.

Although the government has yet to offer up a concrete plan and insists that much study needs to be done, ideas bruited have included legalization of betting on international football matches as well as the establishment of legal casinos in certain tourist destinations including Phuket.

Here, the *Gazette's* **Pathomporn Kaenkrachang** and **Sompratch Saowakhon** ask local officials what they think of opening a casino in Phuket.

Thailand. The profits from these are not taxed and must be laundered before they can enter the legitimate economy. With legal casinos, the industry could be monitored and some profits would go straight into the government coffers, where they could be used to fund education and other projects to benefit society," he said.

"I see so many Thai people traveling abroad to gamble at casinos. Why not set up a place where they can gamble legally here?" he asked.

Col Paween however, doesn't think Phuket is the right place in Thailand for a casino.

"It is not suitable for Phuket because the island's strong point is its natural beauty.

So I support a casino, but not in Phuket. The best place to set up casinos would be remote, undeveloped areas. That would make them easier to regulate and control," he said.

Once legal casinos open, the

police would need to crack down on their illegal competitors, otherwise they would face even more problems from gambling than ever before, he said.

Col Paween likened the problem to prostitution which, while illegal in Thailand, is nevertheless widespread. Failure to regulate such vices can result in the spread of deadly diseases like HIV/Aids and a slew of social problems, he said.

Before opening any casinos, the government should first undertake a thorough study of casino operations abroad to ensure that the most suitable management system is established in Thailand, he said

"We have to do our homework, otherwise international criminals could use the casinos as an excuse to bring large amounts of laundered money into the country," he said.

Despite his concerns, Col Paween supports the idea.

"Every new idea inevitably meets with some opposition, but if we concentrate on setting it up in the right way, it will be a success and win praise in the end," he said. turer in the humanities and social science department at Phuket Rajabhat University, harbors numerous reservations about building a casino.

"Thailand is a predominantly Buddhist country, so it is not surprising that the majority of the people are opposed to this idea," he said.

"To start, just how many Thai people will alter their gambling habits and become casino members?" he asked.


Siting a casino here would be a regional issue, so public hearings would need to be held in all six Andaman coast provinces not just Phuket, he said.

Noting that rural Thais traditionally gamble on things like cockfighting and bullfighting, K. Sontaya said the government needs to consider what affect the introduction of western-style casinos would have on Thai culture. they won't be meant for local people, but a completely different class of player. So my question is: who is the government planning to set up casinos for?"

According to reports, PM Samak's plan would include letting foreigners in for free while charging Thais a one-time membership fee of 100,000 baht.

K. Sontaya expressed concern that the plan as envisioned by PM Samak would have little impact on deeply-ingrained gambling habits among the majority of Thais, for whom casino gambling is little more than a foreign curiosity.

Legalized gambling would be in conflict with Article 83 of the new Constitution, which states that the government must uphold and support the principles of HM The King's Sufficiency Economy theory, he said.

land would be outweighed by the problems they cause, such as increased crime and family problems," he said.

He also questioned why Thailand constantly feels the need to follow foreign trends.

'We do not need to compare ourselves with neighboring countries on the casino issue. We have different competitive advantages. For example, why don't we explore ways to improve local agriculture first? I think there are many more interesting and creative paths to follow than trying to legalize casinos.

"I want the government to go back and review the Constitution and all existing laws, changing them as necessary before proceeding with this idea. If we are going to allow legal casinos, first we will require a legal framework for them," he said.

Also opposed to the idea of a casino in Phuket is Phummisak Hongsyok, one of Thailand's 74 appointed Senators and former long-time mayor of Phuket City.

K. Phummisak agrees with the idea of setting up casinos in Thailand, but not in Phuket.

"The island is both a business and tourism hub that continues to attract investment in both these sectors. It would be better to site a casino in a less developed part of some other province as a way of spurring growth

"As we have no lack of people wanting to invest here, we should ask ourselves what we have already and what we need more of." said Senator Phummisak, whose company Anupas & Sons controls a 250rai site off Chao Fa West Rd in Wichit that some might see as an ideal location for a casino.

Casinos in Thailand would need to be tightly regulated, with laws in place to protect the government, casino operators and players. This would include thorough background checks of all potential staff to ensure they don't have criminal records," he added.

If casinos are set up, they should be located in remote, difficult-to-access locations such as on an island. This would discourage Thai people from going there, make it easy control the standard of people allowed in and minimize social problems.

Target groups should include rich people and foreigners,

Phuket Chamber of Commerce President Eam Thavornwongwongse said the gambling issue is highly sensitive and thus required very careful consideration of the costs and benefits.

"Thai people always worry when the subject of gambling is raised; they feel very anxious about the problems that could be created," he said.

While noting that legalized gambling would be a new source of government revenue, he worries about the effect on people addicted to games of chance.

A possible model to follow would be the one in Malaysia, where the casinos target affluent people and allow gamblers to leave a certain amount at the door so that they won't spend all they have with them at the time.

However, K. Eam, a shareholder in the Kata Group of hotels, feels that Phuket is not a good choice for a casino because gamblers tend to be more interested in gambling than natural

'In my opinion it should be located far from large population centers, in the same way that Las Vegas was," he said.

However, if the government does allow casinos they should be large, world-class facilities on the same scale as those now being built in Singapore, he said.

Such a facility should be well-planned with complete facilities for tourists and with ex-

pertise from abroad in managing gaming operations, he said.

Noting the success of the Genting Casino in Muslim-majority Malaysia, K Eam does not see Thai Buddhism as a great hindrance.

Α more likely obstacle, in

his opinion, is whether all the public hearings, study, legal amendments and other requirements needed to make the idea a reality could actually be carried out within the term of a single administration.

Equally skeptical is Promchote Traivate, head of the Phuket Office of Sports and Recreation Development.

He worries that legalizing casinos could open a Pandora's Box of problems that the government would be unable to control.

"Law enforcement is a big problem in Thailand, especially compared to other countries where casinos operate successfully," he noted.

"They are better at controlling their people's behavior [through law enforcement] than we are. Perhaps this is something we should consider," he said.

He added that the government should also consider what message legalizing casinos might send the the nation's youth.

K., Promchote is also worried about the effect that opening a casino might have on the island's well-established reputation as a "natural" destination.

"Casinos could damage that reputation and reduce Phuket's perceived attractiveness to the current target group.

Over 55% of those

surveyed in the recent

ABAC poll said they

thought of gambling

as a "normal thing",

while 35% admitted

they had gambled

before.

Tourists have told me that it

is easy to find casinos abroad so that if a casino is built in Phuket it should be something unique and special."

These leaders' positions seems to accurately reflect the opinion on the street, where many people

seem to feel that Thailand simply "isn't ready" for legalized gambling.

A woman identified only as Aorachon, aged 32, said she felt the government has yet to offer any good reasons for allowing legal casinos in a Buddhist country such as Thailand.

"We've gotten along well enough as a society without them for all these years, so why do we need them now?" she asked.

"The government should be seeking creative and moral solutions to the problems faced by society, not simply legalizing bad behavior, she said.

## Thais unprepared for retirement

hailand urgently needs a viable pension system, a panel of speakers warned at a seminar on March 7.

The seminar, organized by the Government Pension Fund (GPF), invited experts from various fields to provide views on the subject of retirement planning.

All of the speakers voiced concern that many Thais remain financially, physically and mentally ill-equipped for retirement. Compounding the problem is a rapidly aging population.

The Bank of Thailand has warned that a large majority of Thais do not have access to financial products and they do not understand how to use the few options available to them.

Since the birth rate has stalled and people are living longer, the government needs to make retirement planning a national priority, said Kobsak Pootrakul, director of the Stock Exchange of Thailand Research Institute

According to research by the GPF, the elderly now make up about 10% of the populace. The number is expected to rise to 20% over the next 20 years. The seven working adults now supporting a retiree will be reduced to four by that time.

There are generally three columns of support for retirees: social security; mandatory pensions or provident funds.

Thailand is one of the few developing countries not to have a mandatory pension or provident-fund scheme, said Wisit Tantitsunthorn, secretary-general of the GPE

Its absence stretches the role of the social security system, he said.

**Commercial breaks.** Advertising on pay-TV channels is expected to boom following enforcement of the new Broadcasting Act. The new law allows at least six minutes per hour of advertising on cable and satellite television.

Until recently, such advertising was banned.

KGI Securities (Thailand) said advertising on cable TV would be a huge benefit for the industry, allowing advertising agencies to target niche markets at lower costs than through mass media, such as free television.

True Visions, the pay-TV operator of True Corp, is expected to gain additional revenue from broadcasting commercials. However, True Corp CEO Supachai Chearavanont said that he expected the extra revenue to account for only 10% of True Visions' total.

**Gland illusion.** A Dubai man died of heart failure after he received injections to enlarge his penis at a Bangkok clinic.

Saeb Almansouri, 50, died at Paolo Siam Hospital late on the night of March 7, police said.

He was admitted to the hospital after he went into shock after receiving two injections on his organ at a clinic on Soi Paowana, off Lard Prao Rd in Bangkok, earlier that day.

**Speedy delivery.** Police in Samut Prakan arrested a KFC

delivery boy for allegedly selling *ya bah* (methamphetamine) to local teenagers.

Nopporn Sathitprom, 24, was arrested in front of Big C department store in Bang Plee district at 10 am.

He admitted that he has been sidelining as a drug pusher, buying the drugs from two women and retailing them to customers.

Dressing as KFC delivery boy and hiding the drug in the delivery box had allowed him to avoid police inspections, he said

Following his arrest, police later had Nopporn contact the women to deliver him the drug at two different rendezvous locations, where police arrested them in the afternoon.

The women were identified as Thassani Pikulhom, 29, and Ratchanee Thetrungruang, 34.

**Stoning death.** Anupong Saipetch, 13, died of serious head injuries early on March 9 after a teenager threw a stone into his father's moving truck.

The incident took place on Phetchkasem Rd in Phetchaburi province.

Police are now trying to

 $track\ down\ Anupong's\ attackers.$ 

The incident is only the latest in a deadly new trend that started last year and has spread throughout the country.

**Thumbs down.** Most Thais are against legalizing casinos, according to a recent survey by the Assumption University.

The survey showed that 56.4% of all respondents gave the firm "no" to Prime Minister Samak Sundaravej's controversial idea that Thailand should finally host casinos.

The survey canvassed 2,726 people in 18 provinces.

**Merit deficit.** More than 2,000 Thais are waiting for an organ transplant, but there are just 93 donors registered with the Thai

Red Cross nationwide.

The greatest number of transplant candidates need kidneys, with more than 2,000 registered.

Thai Red Cross organ donation center director Dr Visist Dhitavat said that many people do not want to donate organs because they believe that their body will not be complete in the next life

People should donate organs to help other people and to make merit, he said.

**Cyber spoiler.** Diageo (Thailand), distributors of Johnnie Walker, has launched a 50-million-baht campaign to help keep underage patrons out of drinking establishments by using finger-print-scan technology to help verify the age of pub patrons.


Before gaining entry to a pub, one has to display an identification card. However, the next time just a finger scan suffices – either at the bar where the person registered or any other venue participating in the project.

The pilot project has been tested at 11 venues in the Thonglor-Ekamai areas of Bangkok. Diageo plans to roll out the project at 100 venues by year's end.

Some 20,000 drinkers have already registered at the 12 participating pubs.

#### oh Samui may finally claim city status this month after the majority of village leaders narrowly voted in favor of the proposal.

In a meeting on February 15, village chiefs and subdistrict chiefs from all parts of the island voted 18 to 14 in approval for Samui to apply for city status (tessabaan nakhon), which will bring in much needed funds from Surat Thani to improve the island.

The assessment for the upgrade in status included an audit to calculate the total revenue the island generated for the past year as well as a count of the population. Samui is said to have ticked all the boxes in relation to these requirements, pulling in more than 10 billion baht a year in revenue with a population of only 50,066 registered residents.

Samui Mayor Varakorn Rattanarak has been an outspoken supporter of the proposal and was asked to try to bring leaders together after a petition opposing the idea was sent to government leaders in Surat Thani.

Opposition to the proposal was due to concerned village leaders whose jobs will be reassigned under the new status. The chiefs argued that as a city, Samui would be more difficult to manage and basic services would no longer be in place to help people

living in more rural parts of the island.

The opponents believe they are better equipped to help in matters at the grassroots level with the existing island hierarchy starting in the villages.

"We want the governor of Surat Thani to approve this as soon as possible so that we can move forward and send it to the Department of Provincial Administration," said Mayor Varakorn.

One of the attendees at the meeting, Jaroen Jantra, of Bophut, said that he believed those in attendance had nothing to do with the petition.

"If some people do not agree with the change, I think it's a pity.

The new status would help a lot in terms of financial power and manpower needed to develop the island," he said.

If the plan goes forward, the village chiefs and subdistrict chiefs will lose their jobs within a

Mayor Varakorn said plainly that after the vote has been sent to Bangkok and following further objection, he is willing to name and shame anyone who is looking out for their own best interest before that of the island.

In response to claims that the present system allows for more efficient services, the mayor said, "We will have a community board set up with repre-

sentatives from nine areas. These will replace the village chiefs and subdistrict chiefs. These community committees will take charge of the problems of people and pro-

His heartbroken girlfriend told police that the pair had gone to dinner at a local restaurant after the victim finished work as a security guard at one of the island's high-end resorts.

After they finished their meal, they went for a motorbike ride. Soon after, they discovered they were being followed by someone on a motorbike.

K. Thaworn's motorbike was rammed, causing him to fall. He was then beaten, stabbed and left for dead.

After investigations, police arrested a man named only as "Nuang" (last name withheld), who admitted to the stabbing, police said, stating he was overcome by jealously when he saw his exgirlfriend with another man.

Frenchman dies. French tourist Abdel Haksin, 36, has died in hospital from injuries sustained in

> a serious motorbike crash while he was holidaying on Samui in January.

Witnesses to the accident say that Mr Haksin was driving a Honda CBR400 motorbike at high speed when he lost control bumped into another motorbike, propelling into a nearby shop.

## Songkhla massacre man surrenders

man who shot dead a hospital director and seven others during a weekend drinking party surrendered to police on the morning of March 7.

Vinus Chukamnerd, 52, had his wife contact police to take him into custody from in front of a market in Krabi at 6 am.

He was taken back to Songkhla, where police had him re-enact the shootings. More than 100 officers were deployed to prevent the crowd from attacking him during the re-enactment.

Vinus told reporters that he became angry when eight people, including Dr Suthatip Thammachart, director of Namom Hospital in Songkhla, were being loud during a drinking session at his next-door neighbor's house.

Vinus said he had earlier warned Suthatip's boyfriend Trirat Choto to stop being loud because he could not sleep. He needed to wake up early to work in a rubber plantation he told Trirat, who was also killed in the shooting.

Trirat and his friends often held drinking sessions at a sala at Trirat's house, Vinus added. He said that he had asked Trirat to be quiet, but Trirat argued that he was drinking on his own prop-

Vinus said he told Trirat that if he was noisy again within three days, he would shoot him.

The eight revelers were shot with an automatic pistol late on Saturday night, March 1. Vinus fled to Krabi.

Songkhla police chief Maj Gen Wirun Iampaijit said that Vinus decided to surrender because he found it hard to continue on the run.

Vinus said he bought the CZ 75B pistol, from a man identified only as "Ping", five months earlier. Neighbors said Vinus has been practicing shooting ever since.

Most of his victims were shot in the head. One of the victims was his own brother-in-law, Boontip Desro.



#### RANONG ROUNDUP

Thai officials in Ranong rounded up dozens of Rohingya on March 7 as they attempted to enter Thailand illegally on a fishing boat. The Rohingya are a Muslim ethnic group from Myanmar's Rakhine State, close to the border with Bangladesh.

Last year, nearly 1,000 Rohingyas were arrested in Ranong, which many use as a transit point on their way to Malaysia, where there is a substantial Rohingya community.

Vinus said he did not know that his brother-in-law was also drinking there and that he was blinded by his rage, so he shot all the people present.

#### 80 insurgents surrender.

Eighty members of an insurgent group in Yala took part in a ceremony to surrender to the authorities March 7.

The ceremony, held at Yaha District Office, was chaired by Yala Governor Teera Mintrasak.

The former insurgents are residents of six villages in two tambons of the district; three of them are leaders of the insurgent group in the district, Governor Teera said.

An official from the Yala Islamic Committee performed a ceremony to annul the religious oath the insurgents had earlier taken part in to bind them in the fight for separation of the southern border provinces, Gov Teera added.

**Dry days.** After a full month without rain, Satun Vice-Governor Chusak Maneechayangkul on March 7 declared the province's Muang, La-ngu, Thung Wa and Kuan Kalong districts as disaster areas.

The Satun Governor's Office has allocated 50 million baht in relief for residents of the four districts.

The declaration allowed each district administration to use 1.5 million baht to help its residents without having to seek approval from the Governor's Office first, V/Gov Chusak said.

**Rapist jailed.** The son of a Surat Thani Democrat Party MP was jailed for 12½ years for rape and firearms offenses on March 3.

Saengroj "Uan" Kanchana, 35, was found guilty of raping a 19-year-old student at gunpoint in January, 2005. Three accomplices also received custodial sentences.

On the day of the attack, Saengroj paid two female friends to lure his victim into his car, the court heard.

He and a friend, Thiraphong "Nat" Jirawong, 20, then drove the woman to a house in Surat's Kanchanadit district, where Saengroj threatened her with a handgun and forced her to have sex with him.

Thiraphong was also sentenced to 12½ years in prison after being found guilty of being an accessory to rape.

The two women who lured the victim into Saenroj's car, Sisila "Palm" Jirawong, 19, and Jiyaphon "Jeab" Thaisuriyan, also 19, both received four-year jail terms.

The victim, a vocational college student at a Surat Thai poly-

technic, was the niece of a police lieutenant colonel. After the attack, relatives of the victim contacted her uncle, who ensured the case was pushed forward.

Saengroj's lawyer said that he would launch an appeal against the verdict.

**Killer crash.** Seven people, including a baby boy, were killed in Chumphon's Lamae district on March 7 when the pickup truck they were traveling in smashed into the back of a parked 18-wheeler.

Six other people traveling in the back of the pickup were also injured.

Police reported that the pickup, driven by Jirasak Duang-chankan, 42, was traveling at high speed in heavy rain through Ban Khao Luang Village 3, Tambon Phor Daeng, when it crashed into the back of the large truck, which was parked by the side of the road.

Three of the victims were identified as Huan Iamphakdee, Bunnam Kaowmanee and Urai Wimonlasuk, all Chumphon natives.

The bodies of a woman about 20 years old, a man about 60 years old and a baby boy about 8 months old had yet to be identified at the time of going to press.

Six injured survivors who were riding in the back of the pickup were rushed to hospital. Police are now searching for the driver of the 18-wheeler, who fled the scene and did not return for his truck.

The bend where the crash happened is a renowned accident blackspot, especially in heavy rain.

## Sea Gypsies offered olive branch

RAWAI: A truce has been reached in the dispute between Sea Gypsies and longtail boat operators in Rawai over rights to ferry tourists to nearby islands.

The man who brokered the agreement, Rawai Mayor Aroon Solos, considered the conflict settled after a meeting on February 27, when the Sea Gypsies agreed to register their vessels with the Marine Department and abide by the same regulations as other longtail boat operators.

"The whole dispute resulted from misunderstanding on both sides and the fact that the Sea Gypsies didn't know about all the government regulations on longtail boat operators in the tourism industry," he said.

The conflict came close to violence on February 11, when three foreign tourists hired out a longtail boat operated by Sea Gypsy Pian Sae-ngor to take them from Rawai to Koh Hei, about five kilometers offshore.

In a formal complaint lodged with Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit three days later, a group of 10 Sea Gypsies led by Niran Yangpan alleged that

a group of rival longtail boat operators forcibly removed the engine from K. Pian's vessel, warning him never to return to the island – or face the consequences.

The boat engine was later returned when some witnesses to the incident intervened and negotiated a compromise, K. Niran Yangpan told the *Gazette*.

In response to the incident, the Sea Gypsies asked the Gov-

ernor for provincial support in protecting them while they tried to make a living.

The Damrongtham Center, which serves as the provincial ombudsman's office, accepted the letter on the Governor's behalf.

It wasn't the first time the Sea Gypsies had approached the province asking for protection.

In February 2007, some 100 Rawai sea gypsies petitioned the Governor to help settle an ongoing, sometimes violent dispute over fishing rights near resorts when one of their members suffered decompression sickness after having his oxygen supply hose cut while diving off Nui Beach on December 31, 2006.

One Sea Gypsy fishing method involves fishermen walking on the seabed and breathing oxygen pumped through a hose from a surface vessel.

The hose was allegedly cut by a resort operator on a jet-ski, who didn't want the sea gypsies fishing activities to spoil the view of visiting tourists, the plaintiff said. The man was charged with attempted murder and the case is still being heard in court.

On the morning of February 19, the Sea Gypsies' latest complaint was discussed at a meeting chaired by Vice Governor Smith Palawatvichai.

Attending were representatives of various agencies including the Phuket Provincial Fishery Office, Chalong Police, Rawai Municipality, Muang District Office, Marine and Coastal Resources Center, as well as the Sea Gypsies who lodged the complaint.

At the meeting, V/Gov Smith requested that Mayor Aroon find ways to continue to help the Sea Gypsy longtail boat operators, who recently begun working in the tourism industry after completing training courses offered by the Tourism and Sports Ministry's Office of Tourism Development.

The two-day course, held in May last year, was funded under the government's *Yoo Dee Mee Suk* (good life and happiness) project.

K. Pian was one of 13 Sea Gypsies who attended and passed the course, allowing him to operate a longtail boat ferry service for tourists.

The training was intended to get Sea Gypsies jobs in the tourism industry to supplement income from their traditional livelihood – fishing.

K. Aroon told the provincial meeting that the best way to mediate the dispute was to sit both sides down together and explain to the longtail boatmen that the Sea Gypsies had the right to operate longtail ferry services – as long as they complied with all the relevant rules and regulations.

"Those longtail boat operators formed a group ferrying tour-

ists in the Rawai area and they didn't know that some of the Sea Gypsy villagers are now allowed to compete with them," said K. Aroon.

The meeting, at Rawai Municipality Offices on the morning of February 27, was attended by about 60 Rawai longtail boat operators and 30 Sea Gypsies. Also attending as witnesses were representatives from the Chalong Police and Marine Department Region 5 office in Phuket.

In the end, both sides came to understand that although the Sea Gypsies had certificates issued by the Tourism Authority of Thailand Southern Region 4 office allowing them to operate, they had not yet registered their boats with the Marine Office, as required by law, before starting to ferry passengers.


Municipal officers would help guide the Sea Gypsies through the process, which should be completed this month, said K. Aroon.

Villagers in the predominantly Muslim fishing village of Bang Khon Tee in Rawai who also completed the *Yoo Dee Mee Suk* training were also experiencing similar problems getting their fishing boats properly registered.

They would also get assistance from the Municipality in getting properly registered by the month's end, K. Aroon said.

"After registration, everyone who does this kind of business must comply with Marine
Office regulations. These include having a life jacket and insurance for each passenger as
well as observing limits on how
many passengers can board
each vessel. We will also set
standard passenger fares for hiring boats to local islands," he
added.

Sea Gypsy representative Niran Yangpan told the *Gazette* that about 80 Sea Gypsy villagers have been registered for various training courses under the *Yoo Dee Mee Suk* program, but that only about 15 of the community's boats would be used as ferries.

To be sure, my relationship with all culinary things Thai wasn't exactly enhanced when every housefly within five miles zoomed in on our kitchen for a knees-up every time my old lady opened the fermented fish jar. And fiery tom yam goong and somtam soon put paid to my stomach lining, admittedly along with countless gallons of Chang chased down by Sang Som rum.

If someone had told me 10 years ago that I'd be literally fed up with Thai fare, I'd have laughed in their face, but the fact remains that some Thai cuisine, at least for me, has become somewhat of an acquired distaste.

That leaves only the rest of the world's cuisine to choose from, doesn't it? So let's go. German? Nein danke. French? Trop riche pour moi. English? Are you joking? Italian? Basta pasta





miles break out on the faces of the kids as they return home from school and their mother greets them.

They surround her and vie for her attention, the younger ones wrapping themselves around her legs, older ones finding the crook of an arm or her shoulder to grab.

Mother gives each one of them her undivided attention one at a time as they show off a drawing or an origami bird that they made in school.

The abundance of smiles and homely air of maternal love and affection is touching.

There are tears from kids, too, as they relate to mother the quarrels and teasing they faced during the day or how they are missing someone.

Gradually, the older kids settle down at tables to do their homework, while the younger ones with talcum-powdered faces clamber about on the play equipment.

Their "mother" is Ajarn Wanasiri Taebanpakul, without whom, these healthy, well behaved and content children might not have a place to call home.

Ajarn Wanasiri is the "big mother" for the children staying at Phuket Sunshine Village (PSV), a home for children with-

## Mothering a home of many hearts

out parents on Koh Sireh.

Sunshine Village was conceived by members of Child Watch Phuket and the Lions Club Phuket Andaman Sea after the 2004 tsunami. A board of seven directors was formed and they went about seeking funding from donors and other charities.

Administering the bureaucracy that goes with charitable funding for million-baht projects mean the board soon needed a full-time administrator. A hardworking administrator was found, the paperwork was eventually completed and the French Red Cross offered its support to get the project off the ground.

The French Red Cross' con-

tribution was to take over construction of the eight single-story homes on a tranquil three-rai plot, and to hand the project over to the PSV Foundation after the building was complete.

Franco Ferri, one of PSV's directors, explained that the foundation was then faced with the challenge of finding someone who could run the village and be a substitute mother for the 42 children aged between two and 14 who now stay at there.

'We knew that the village needed a very rare and special individual, someone who would really put their heart in the project and have the time and energy to dedicate their life to the well-being of the children. The foundation is very fortunate to have found Ajarn Wanasiri to fulfill that role," said Franco.

Ajarn Wanasiri is a former administration officer and teacher at Satree Phuket School. Now she rises early in the morning to greet the children for breakfast and send them off to school and she's always there when they return, staying until late at night, when the children have all finally settled.

The job doesn't end there though. It's a 24-hour commitment that very few people would have the dedication to fulfill.

Caring for this group of children, each with a distressing story of life before Sunshine Village, means sleepless nights for some and constant vigils kept by Ajarn Wanasiri and the six other substitute mothers who have a number of children under their

Many of the children at the

village have suffered traumatic events in their lives. Some have never known their real parents or had a place to call home before. Now, under Ajarn Wanasiri's care, the children have a home and a mother who is always there

Although some of the children staying at the village are local and still see their

natural parents regularly, they have a home at the Sunshine Village where adults have time for

them and provide a safe and nurturing environment – a stark contrast to the world of poverty, neglect or abuse many of them were born into.

The children are taught to be responsible for themselves, each other and their home.

"Teaching the children responsibility and helping them to understand that this is now their

home can take time. Many of them come from environments with no parental support or supervision, or they may have been physically or mentally abused," said Ajarn Wanasiri.

A quiet six-year-old boy is hanging onto Ajarn Wanasiri while she is saying this. She strokes his head and praises him

for being good. She explains that the boy from Sakorn Nakorn province is excited about going to school for the first time

when next term begins.

'Our job is to make

these children feel

valued again.'

She doesn't go into the details of the boy's history, but it is clear that with his new mother's care, he has gradually overcome behavioral problems stemming from the stress of existing in an uncaring environment that prevented him from attending school with his peers.

children feel valued again, while also giving them the social and academic skills to make their own way in life when they eventually leave the village," Ajarn Wanasiri said.

The Sunshine Village aims to provide a nurturing environment for the children. As well as love and support, there is structure in the children's lives. The children who are old enough have to take care of their own washing and ironing and keep their rooms clean. There are schedules for dividing tasks and every effort is made to preserve a system of fairness.

Ajarn Wanasiri explained that there are no hard and fast criteria for the children who are accepted here. Some of the children here still have parents who visit them regularly, while some were abandoned at birth and have never seen the face of their natural mother.

"We are very lucky to have found such dedicated staff," she said. "This really isn't an average job. Volunteers come and go, and we welcome them all, but your heart has to be in it to always be there for your charges."

A lot of thought went into the planning of the Sunshine Vil-

lage. The main building has a library upstairs, equipped with donated books in English and Thai, plus a bank of computers.

Each of the homes has a name, shown on a plaque at the front, along with recognition for significant donors. There is an outdoor activity area with playground equipment covered with a colorful awning donated by local awning manufacturer Shades.

"Some donors have specific requests for what they want their donated money to go towards. Of course, donations are always welcome and in the future we will need to rely on the continued generosity of charities and individuals to keep the village running," Franco explained.

The village is not just nice, modern buildings in well-kept grounds. With Ajarn Wanasiri at the helm, it is a village filled with the love of young and old hearts, living together in a place they can happily call home.





he multi-seat Ssangyong Stavic has recently been launched in Thailand and promises to be a multipurpose vehicle (MPV) with a big future despite Ssangyong's checkered history.

Established in 1939 as an engineering company and progressing to a Korean chaebol, or conglomerate, the company entered the motoring industry when it produced the aluminum bodies for the ill-fated Panther Kallista.

The bodies were pretty much hand-built, meaning each one was slightly different, making final construction in Weybridge, England, rather hitand-miss.


The plastic grille, for example, was fitted by eye – no jigs – to ensure it was in the center of the nose.

Additionally, the front suspension mounts had to be modified with the introduction of up to 10 washers to make them fit.

In 1987, Panther's thenowner, Korea's Young C Kim, sold the company to Ssangyong and in 1988 Ssangyong took over full production of the Panther.

In 1997, Ssangyong introduced the Chairman, a semiluxury sedan based on Mercedes Benz mechanicals, but things turn a turn for the worse in 1998, when Ssangyong suffered greatly during the Asian economic crisis and linked up for a while with fellow Korean-automaker Daewoo.

Daewoo has since been absorbed by General Motors with Ssangyong now controlled by China's Shanghai Automotive



# Stavic unleashed in Thailand

To be invested over the next five years, this puts the Korean company on a secure footing and will enable new models to be developed, both in Korea and in Shanghai, where a number of Korean engineers have been seconded.

The Stavic is an eleven-seat MPV with sufficient versatility to enable seats to be folded, turned

to face each other or removed altogether in the case of the rearmost seats.

The Stavic's power plant is a 2.7-liter, five-cylinder, turbocharged, common-rail diesel engine, sourced from Mercedes Benz, but built under license in South Korea.

The engine is mated to a five-speed, tiptronic, automatic gearbox, also of Mercedes origin. Power output is a modest 163bhp (122kW), while peak torque, produced between 1,800rpm and 3,250rpm, is a healthy 342Nm.

Standard equipment includes ABS and an electronic brake-distribution system (EBD), dual front airbags, cruise control, rain-sensing windshield wipers and automatic headlamps.

There are two- and fourwheel-drive models, while a sunroof and rear parking sensor are optional on selected models.

The body styling is not quite done in-house, with Turin's Pininfarina having had some input, although SAIC is developing various cars in South Korea and Shanghai. Ssangyong describes the styling of the Stavic as "neo-fusion".

The Stavic has clean lines and a flowing roof profile ending in a discreet spoiler. The front and rear lights are distinctive and add to the uncluttered design.


This car is sold in Australia, where it has the distinction of being the only rear-drive people mover on the market.

Its considerable seating capacity and cargo area ensured that it was well received by the Aussies, but whether it can achieve similar success in Thailand has yet to be seen.


The two-wheel drive Stavic SV starts at around 1.39 million baht, while the top-of-the range 4WD sells at more than 2.05 million baht.

There is a three-year, 100,000-kilometer warranty and free maintenance at 1,000km and 10,000km. The Phuket distributor is TBV Auto Service on Chao Fa East Rd, locted opposite Phuket Villa 3.

#### hat will Phuket be like in the future? Will it be the ecotourism destination many are hoping for, or will the island become something else entirely? A friend inspired this column by writing, "In a couple years, Phuket will just be more concrete, brothels, golf courses and endless shophouses. Quality, thinking tourists will go elsewhere." Let's look at the worstcase scenario.

It's 2020. Khao Lak is out. Cyclone Hyacinth of 2012 took care of that. With unstable global warming pushing the traditional cyclone path 300 kilometers east, Hyacinth pushed an eight-meter storm surge into Khao Lak's flatlands. No lives were lost, but property damage was on a par with a tsunami.

Phuket is now a cross between the Costa del Sol and Orange County. Water stolen from Phang Nga and Ranong is pumped onto the island through four 3-meter pipes, drying out forests to the north. The water is pumped to the resorts that now ring the island, with a few mudflats on the east coast.

Most of the hillsides slipped when Hyacinth's rains washed away the homes and roads that replaced the forests. Mother Nature destroyed many of the island's developments.

If you look at the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) numbers, Phuket tourism is booming. Unfortunately, quality tourists left long ago, forced out by massvolume, low-quality groups. Many of the five-star resorts were returned to their reinforced concrete shells, sold at a loss and re-opened as two-star properties to feed the Asian tour market.

Phang Nga National Park is now a rubbish-filled playground for factory workers. Wildlife in Southern Thailand disappeared from all areas accessible to humans. HIV/Aids has returned to the beer bars because the market refuses to wear condoms.

## Looking beyond 'Paradise Sold'



It's the same year, 2020, but this time we're at a hotel in Kerala, India. The hotel is elegant and without the energy-intensive reinforced concrete, air conditioning, harsh lighting and water heaters of our possible future Phuket.

The Kerala hotel is at one with the elements. The basic earthen structure has been tested over thousands of years to create comfort during drought and monsoons. Rooms are large and temperate. Even the swimming pool is natural, using traditional plants to aerate and clean the water. The five-star market says energy-consuming infrastructure is a no-no in the era of global warming, so the hotel is fully booked year-round by quality environmental guests looking for authentic culture.

There are no Las Vegasstyle floor shows here. The Indians are proud of their culture. You can take a paddle boat down a traditional reed-lined canal to participate in an intimate show. There are no rubber-chicken buffet dinners to feast on. Your meal is presented with the pride of a culture 4,000 years old. Land is at a premium due to over-population, therefore vegetarianism is "in" by

A traditional barge big enough for a family navigates a network of canals restored to their Colonial-era ambiance. You hear shorebirds while trundling to the next cultural stop or traditional restaurant.

Fields run to the horizon, all groomed and rubbish-free. An occasional water buffalo and farmer work their plough and trees pepper the flat landscape and its maze of quiet canals – no longtail boats in sight.

East of this vision of a future Phuket, Puerto Princesa in the Philippines has an international airport that is 10 years old. Green Globe logos front every eco-lodge. If a developer doesn't meet Green Globe standards, he isn't allowed

to build. Every beach is clean, with seas so pure needn't wonder what you are diving into.

The destination is promoted as "the city in a forest" because that's exactly what it is. There's an environmental festival every month. Instead of mass-tourism tours, visitors often go mangrove planting.



## Play It Again, Woody

often begin book reviews by introducing the author, his life and works. Woody Allen needs no introduction. .Director, screenwriter, comic actor, Allen has won four Academy Awards and produced such masterpieces as Annie Hall and Manhattan. The 73-year-old New Yorker has recently undergone a creative re-birth in London where, following in the footsteps of Diane Keaton and Mia Farrow, Scarlett Johanson has been his muse for *Match Point* and *Scoop*.

Allen has also published four slim books of humor: Getting Even, Without Feathers, Side Effects and, most recently, Mere Anarchy (Random House, New York, 2007, 160pp). Mere Anarchy is a collection of 18 short pieces, mostly published in *The New Yorker*.

Generally his modus operandi is to notice an obscure news item and then run a comic riff off it. His exuberant comic language is its own reward. Take this introductory passage to "Calisthenics, Poison Ivy, Final Cut":

"As a hatchling chloroformed and shanghaied each summer to various lakeside facilities bearing Indian names where I struggled to master the dog paddle under the baleful eyes of capos otherwise known as counselors, my atten-



tion was pinioned recently by something in the back pages of The New York Times Magazine.

Amongst the usual dumping grounds where well-heeled parents might stash their sniveling issue and savor a comatose July and August were ads for such trendy modern specialties as basketball camp, magic camp, computer camp, jazz camp, and, perhaps the most glamorous of all,

"This pricey inspiration seems a long way from Camp Melanoma, run by Moe and Elsie Varnishke in Loch Sheldrake, where I suffered the dog days of my fourteenth year playing dodgeball and keeping the calamine-lotion industry solvent.'

This leads to a nine-page comic shtick

film wunderkind and the greedy camp owner who wants a cut of the pie.

In fact, many of these stories are set in the purlieus of show business and featured desperately greedy Jewish protagonists trying to scrape up a lucrative hustle. Yiddish words abound. In "This Nib for Hire", a struggling writer named Flanders Mealworm reflects:

"It is said Dostoyevsky wrote for money to sponsor his lust for the roulette tables of St Petersburg. Faulkner and Fitzgerald too leased their gifts to exschmatte moguls who stacked the Garden of Allah with scriveners brought west to spitcall box-office reveries."

Thus Mealworm gets a call from a big Hollywood producer named E. Coli Biggs. The offer? To write a novelization of Three Stooges skits. This leads to a mock-existentialist treatment of violent slapstick that has Moe exclaiming: "We suffer. O woe to the random violence of human existence."

#### Making casinos a safe bet

While Prime Minister Samak Sundarawej pushes on with his plan of establishing casinos in tourist destinations around Thailand, there currently appears to be little support locally for the idea of siting one in Phuket [See Inside Story, page 5].

The unease with which many people have reacted to the plan in Phuket mirrors a nationwide trend revealed by Assumption University's ABAC poll, which found that more people admitted to having gambled before (35%) than those who who actually support the legalization of gambling (32%).

More than anything else, the figures reveal the extent to which Thais view gambling as a vice – rather than a form of entertainment.

One aspect that has emerged from the debate is that all sides seem to agree that it makes sense to set up casinos on Thai soil as a way of parting foreign tourists from their cash – while at the same discouraging or outrightly denying entry to poor and middle-class Thais.

Apparently our paternalistic leaders feel Thais cannot be trusted with the same rights in their own country as those enjoyed by foreigners – at least when it comes to indulging in this particular vice.

This strange reversal of the normal "double pricing" strategy long in use at national parks and other tourist attractions around the country would have the desired affect among all but the richest Thais, who would continue to indulge in the wide variety of gambling options already available to them – legal and otherwise.

While the plan to legalize gambling in general has some definite merits, the details put forward by PM Samak are fundamentally flawed. If the 100,000-baht membership fee for Thais mentioned by PM Samak were introduced, it is hard to imagine why any Thais would pay it.

After all, for most Thais it would only be a bus ride to a border, where they could continue to gamble free of charge and without other restrictions. They would also be starting with a stack of chips worth 100,000 baht, at least taking into consideration the money saved by gambling abroad.

As a result, this would do little to keep the estimated 80 million baht spent by Thai gamblers inside the country – one of the key problems the casinos are meant to address.

Given the lack of Thais in "Thai" casinos, it is likely the casinos would resemble in spirit and atmosphere the same generic tedium that tends to characterize other such venues around Asia – which is why they can't rival a unique destination such as Las Vegas.

Then again, maybe they could add other illicit activities to increase the appeal. After all, there could be a lot of money in it – and Thais wouldn't be subjected.



## EC chief urges residents to make their voices heard

he PEC [Phuket Election Committee] is an independent entity. My staff and I are based at the Provincial Election Commission office and we are employed as government officials. We receive our salaries from the Budget Bureau for the Office of the Prime Minister. Provincial Election Commission officers are transfered to new locations every four years.

As director of the PEC I oversee local and national elections.

I work directly with the EC [Election Commission] and coordinate efforts with the police and other government organizations to manage the distribution and collection of ballot boxes, set up polling stations, deal with complaints and act on reports of election violations.

When ballot counts are complete, I then report election results to the President of the PEC or Phuket Vice-Governor Tri Augkaradacha, who passes the results on to the EC.

In the nine years that I have worked as director for the PEC, I have never heard of any major problems in Phuket.

#### **FIRST PERSON**

or the past nine months, Supap Akkam, direc- tor of the Phuket Election Committee (PEC), has overseen operations in Phuket during general and senate elections.

He moved to the island from Trang Province before the national referendum held in mid-July.

Here K. Supap speaks to *Gazette* reporter Pathomporn Kaenkrachang about ensuring fair elections and how the people of Phuket are contributing to democracy.



One issue of importance is that of ensuring that members of the public know whether they are eligible to vote in a particular election. People are often mistaken about their right to vote in local and national elections, so I urge people to check the list of eligible voters before voting day to see if they are actually on it.

Most of Phuket's voters

turned out for the general election. I think it is very positive that a large number of voters also showed up for local elections.

In the last general election, 74% of the island's eligible voters turned out, showing that Phuket people did not ignore the election.

There was a much lower voter turnout for the senate election [47.3% of Phuket's 219,835 eligible voters], which was due to a new law forbidding senator candidates to enroll on behalf of any political party.

This meant there were no canvassers bringing groups of voters to the polling stations, but I think the results are positive and reflect genuine public opinion because several voters [15.8 %] actually ticked "No vote" on their ballot slip.

Some people have complained that the EC's publicawareness campaign before the senate election was ineffective and led to a low voter turnout. In fact, we focused on public relations for the senate elections much more than we did for the general elections as we wanted to ensure a high voter turnout.

In my opinion, we did the best we could to inform the public of the senate elections and followed the correct procedures, but it is ultimately up to individuals to be aware of their voting rights and make their votes count. That right belongs to the people.

My position as PEC director doesn't come with a bouquet of flowers. When political opponents accuse each other of violations, I have to collect and consider all the evidence and report my findings to the EC, so it is important to ensure fairness.

Of course, you can't please everyone, no matter how fair you are.

Those who are proven innocent of charges will be happy, but those who are proven guilty will hold resentment. Whatever the outcome, it is very important to remain neutral.

There were two claims made by party candidates of violations in the general election, who handed petitions to the PEC during the elections. One claim was that a candidate had unfairly won a seat, the other was concerning the distribution of slanderous leaflets.

Both these cases went to court and the candidates accused of committing the violations were found not guilty.

Alcohol bans during election times from 6 pm the evening before voting day until midnight on voting day help to ensure law and order.

This is a nationwide law that must be enforced, regardless of where the elections are being

Elections for the presidency of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBor-Jor) will be held on April 20. Candidates can enroll from March 17 to 21.

### Third-party claims on compulsory car insurance

I bought an old jeep from somebody who was leaving the island, but the jeep is still registered in the name of the previous owner, whose whereabouts is currently unknown.

When I went to buy the compulsory insurance for it, I just handed over the blue registration book, forgetting to tell the insurance company that the name in the book was not mine and that I was unaware where the previous owner had gone.

So the insurance policy was issued under the name of the previous owner and not mine.

When I balked at paying, I was told by the insurance company, "No problem you can still file a claim on the policy if you are involved in an accident, even if the policy is in somebody else's name."

I took their advice and paid up, but now I am beginning to have doubts about the whole thing. Can you confirm whether I can file an insurance claim and be paid with a check made out to my name, even though the policy is in another person's?

Road worrier Samkong Charot Klinmanee of the Phuket Provincial Transportation Office, replies:

Insurance companies must honor compulsory third-party insurance policies regardless whether or not the owner of the vehicle and the person taking out the insurance coverage are one and the same, so you shouldn't have any problems.

#### AUTHORITY OF THE PEC

The Election Commission can authorize the Provincial Election Commission to perform the following:

- Hold an election and a referendum in that province.
- Propose to the Election Commission constituency boundaries for a constituency-based election.
- Collect and inspect data on the number of voters eli gible to vote in an election or referendum.
- Recommend to the Election Commission the appointment of a person who will be given powers to perform the duties concerning election or referendum voting.
- Perform other activities related to election or referendum voting.

The rules and procedures that dictate the duties of the Provincial Election Commission are decided by the Election Commission.

One problem is that it's inconvenient. Vegetarian restaurants are hard to find in

> Phuket – except during the Vegetarian Festival – and if you cook at home, you have to go out of your way to find ingredients that will give you a balanced diet with a sufficient amount of

We shouldn't spend so much time fussing about our food. People who obsess about food have their priorities wrong.

Another problem is that most vegetarian food is bland and tasteless. There are two exceptions I can think of; maybe readers can think of more.

The first is South Indian vegetarian food, which is one of the top undiscovered cuisines on this planet. Bangkok is one of the great food cities of the world, but it is a blot on its culinary escutcheon that there are so few South Indian restaurants there.

The second exception is the vegetarian food served in the Buddhist temples of Taiwan. Taiwan has vegetarian restaurants where the food is reasonable, but for mouthwatering gastronomical delight, you have to eat in the temples.

The nuns can do things with beancurd that you couldn't imagine. Some

of the dishes taste just like meat, so you can enjoy the flavor of meat without making yourself an accomplice to the murder of animals.

If a South Indian restaurant or a Taiwanese temple that serves food were set up in my neighborhood, I would

become a vegetarian before you could say, "Jack Spratt could eat no fat."

But I would not be dogmatic about it, on the grounds that 1) we shouldn't be fussy about our food, and 2), we shouldn't inconvenience others who may be eating with us.

'y 90-day trial, security-software suite from a big security vendor (BSV) expired recently. I never thought that I would look forward to an expiration date so much.

I have a few reasons for being happy to get rid of it. For one, the BSV suite is overkill. I'm not a high-risk surfer. I do not visit porn or gambling websites or use pirated software, and less than once a year I'm hit with malware.

Also, I use my PC as a normal Windows user as often as I can. If I am hit with a virus or worm, it can only perform actions that I could do as a normal user and not administrator, which avoids a lot of potential damage.

The biggest reason that I wanted to get rid of the BSV suite was that it was just downright annoying. I continuously received pop-up alerts that I couldn't configure to not pop up and when I would have liked to see an alert, I didn't get one.


For example, I set Windows Update not to install updates automatically, but to download them and alert me when they are ready for me to take action. Evidently, this is a security no-no for the BSV software because every time I logged in either as a normal user or administrator, I received an ominous "You have a security problem" error message.

Also, BSV's firewall blocked a program from accessing the Internet once I started it. That's fine, but the trouble was that there was no notice - no beep, no pop-up window – leaving me to furiously double-click on the damned program icon to get it to start when it had already started but the BSV software had blocked it.

Security suites have three major components: firewall, antivirus protection and antiadware and anti-spyware.

A firewall is like a gate – it decides what traffic to let in and, for some firewalls, what to let out. Antivirus software has a database of signatures of known malware and is continuously on the lookout for it on the PC's

As for anti-adware and

anti-spyware, spyware is software that is installed on a PC for financial gain without the owner's consent and adware is roughly a subset of spyware, but both have the same symptoms: unwanted pop-up ads that slow down the PC.

BSV security suites have more components – anti-botware and rootkit detection – but from my experience, the first three components listed are sufficient (consistently doing backups completes the circle).

A popular stack of security programs for Windows XP are AVG antivirus, ZoneAlarm firewall, Spybot Search and Destroy anti-spyware, and Ad-Aware anti-adware. All are free for personal, non-commercial use. I thought it would be fun to walk you through installing these.

After downloading the software, uninstall any current security software, although it's good

all times. If you have a third-party, standalone firewall, leave it on for now. If you have Windows Firewall, remove the third-party

firewall. If the third-party firewall comes as part of a security suite, it's best to remove the entire suite at the same time

I went to my BSV's website to download the removal tool, which some people joke is the best software the BSV has ever written. Yet, it still took longer to remove the software than it did to install and update it.

Next, reboot your PC. Windows always likes a reboot – it's like having a good nose blow.

Now switch Windows Firewall on if you have it installed.

cept the default settings and be sure to update the software during the process – this is crucial because the latest antivirus "sig-

> natures" are downloaded.

The use of ZoneAlarm Free as a firewall in infosec circles is not without detractors. Many say that it slows down a com-

puter and pops up too many alerts, but this sentiment comes from a security-savvy crowd of low-risk surfers.

Windows Firewall can be used, but it only watches traffic coming in and does not monitor outgoing traffic. Installation is straightforward, but stay alert for one section: make sure that you uncheck the box on the main installation page that says, "Include ZoneAlarm Spy Blocker, a free, easy-to-use toolbar that protects you from dangerous sites." You don't need this toolbar.

Configuring ZoneAlarm takes patience. It has a database of known software programs that you can configure in one sitting or you can wait until a pop-up asks you what action you want to take. Most of the time you will want to choose "Allow" - as opposed to "Deny" - and check "Remember this setting" so you don't get more pop-ups about similar situations.

Next, install Spybot Search and Destroy, then AdAware 2007. Some users forgo AdAware, but because the success rate of catching spyware and adware is about 50% per program and this type of malware is very difficult to remove once installed, I see no harm in having both installed and working at the same time.


For Spybot, in the "Select Additional Tasks" step, choose both "SDHelper" for Internet Explorer protection and "TeaTimer" for detecting when system settings are being changed. Update both programs.

I've been using my new free – security suite for several weeks and I'm relieved that I don't have any BSV software annoying me anymore.

PHUKET: Although the recent high-profile testing of WiMax Internet access from a sailboat offshore from Le Meridien Phuket Resort proved successful, the high-speed wireless service is unlikely to grace Phuket's shores this year, the *Gazette* has learned.

The WiMax tests were carried out on February 22 by broadband service provider the Benchachinda Group with its affiliate companies United Information Highway Co Ltd (UIH) and BB Broadband Co Ltd.

Benchachinda Group was

## WiMax tests positive, but roll-out unlikely this year

formerly incorporated as UCOM Co Ltd.

The tests, carried out near Le Meridien Phuket Resort, were just the beginning of a nationwide push to introduce WiMax to Thailand. The effort is being coordinated by the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC), which has awarded exclusive rights to 12 companies to provide WiMax coverage, with each company given exclusive rights in certain areas.

The Benchachinda Group has been allocated Phuket as well

as the Phi Phi Islands, Koh Samui, Koh Pha-ngan and Koh Tao in Chumphon province.

UIH Product Development Director Passakorn Hongsyok told the *Gazette*, "During the tests, we used a PCMCIA card to act as the receiver for a notebook computer. We received the WiMax signal from a WiMax access point set up at Le Meridien. This was connected to the Internet through our own fiberoptic cable network."

Supporting the "last mile" WiMax technology was UIH's own fiber-optic network coupled with the nationwide DTAC network that was originally created by UIH, K. Passakorn explained.

The network comprises 50,000 kilometers of fiber-optic cables spread throughout all 76 provinces. About a decade ago in Phuket, UIH laid a fiber-optic loop that passes through most densely populated areas on the island.

The February 22 tests successfully connected a laptop computer to the Internet at 8 Mbps as the boat sailed about a kilometer offshore.

Sending the connection signal from the hotel was a one-watt tower, which had a range of up to three kilometers, set up specially for the trial.

Although WiMax has been used to provide Internet connec-

tions as far 30km away without line of sight, to ensure continuous coverage to an area such as Patong would likely require about four towers, K. Passakorn explained.

"We would probably use 20W towers, but to determine how they would work in reality in Phuket would require testing," he said.

"We are looking at providing blanket coverage. Once we are permitted to provide WiMax service in Phuket, we will install signal-transmission antennas to cover the whole island," he added.

The tower used in the trial was provided by Motorola, which will provide hardware including antennas, modems and PCMCIA cards that would be used by Benchachinda to deliver the service, if approved.

Like the other 11 companies seeking NTC approval to provide WiMax service, Benchachinda must complete its trials by the end of April. However, it is still early and the criteria for gaining NTC approval are still not clear, K. Passakorn explained.

In addition to trial results, Benchchinda will have to submit to the NTC a general business plan outlining what services would be offered – and at what prices.

"We're looking at rolling out service for corporate users. We would rather not sell direct to consumers," K. Passakorn explained.

WiMax connection packages, once available, will be provided through the group's marketing arm, BB Broadband Co Ltd, better known as BeeNet.





# Gold's new glitter a flash in the pan

he gold price is now trading at record levels after a 28-year gap during which prices fell to almost a quarter of their current price. Even the current prices, pushing US\$1,000 an ounce, are still a long way behind the highs of 1980 when inflation adjusted.

Gold is a more complex investment than it initially appears. Long a dependable source of wealth, it has disappointed investors in recent decades. Imagine that you had bought gold in its physical form near the old high of US\$840 an ounce in 1980. It would have been a serious miscalculation.

In 1980 or any time in the past 40 years, the favored way for investors to enter the gold market was through the stock market, buying shares in gold mining companies. But buying gold in its physical form meant sorting out the transaction and physically storing the gold in a bank vault. However, this facility is now often not available and gold has to be insured. In general, it is a pest.

The introduction of a new

"vehicle" - Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs) - has changed the general approach to investing in physical gold. If an investor today wishes to buy, say, US\$50,000 worth of gold, the investor simply places a trade to purchase this amount inside a selected ETF and the transaction is

ETFs are currently most popular on US stock exchanges, where they are growing like mushrooms. The investor re-

ceives confirmation from the fund manager that "X" amount of gold is being held to the investor's

The whole transaction process is properly regulated. ETFs have a much wider use than just gold. This route to the gold market, because it is so simple and

ETFs are very affordable, has led to a significant increase in the demand for physical gold.

The whole sector of investment in physical gold recently received a significant boost from an unlikely source. It is always important to remember as an investor that factors affecting your investment often come from the most unlikely places, a typical "left field".

Gold Fields of South Africa announced that it expects output of gold to fall by between 20% and 25% this year due to elec-

tricity blackouts in South Africa.

The current ANC government c o m p l e t e l y underinvested in the national electricity supply, led by the **Electricity Supply** C o m m i s s i o n(ESCOM). The sad part is that when the ANC inherited ESCOM less than 14 years ago, it was

completed, often on the Internet. a highly professional, first-world electricity supplier.

Hugh Hendry, chief investment officer at Eclectica, a Hedge Fund Manager, stated on CNBC's Europe Squawk Box, that it would take five years to solve South Africa's electrical problems. Perhaps he should have "hedged" that statement by saying at least five years.

The result for ETFs holding physical gold, or for anyone holding physical gold, was an immediate profit. Investors were more reluctant to buy gold-related shares and wanted direct access to the precious metal.

The positive reason for investing in gold is the recently resurrected role of gold as counterweight to the fortunes of the US dollar. The increase in inflationary pressures is another draw card. In an era of uncertainty, with the US and other areas of the world reeling from losses on subprime and volatility on financial markets, gold is reassuming

its "safe haven" status.
That's the "Goldilocks" scenario (where the market is stable); now for the three bears. First, when the price of gold soars, history shows us that eventually it reaches a price where demand decreases from the jewelry fabrication sector. Around 75% of gold demand is for jewelry fabrication.

When prices overheated in 1980, however, this demand evaporated and for a short time gold prices continued to rise on speculative demand until it collapsed. A graph of this period is different from any other chart I have seen – it looks more like a

This current situation could end in tears as a large percentage of gold ETFs are held by individual private buyers. The tendency for these investors in any market is to try and cram through the exit doors simultaneously when things turn sour.


Gold could well continue its run while the US dollar remains weak and inflationary pressures remain.

1980 was not that long ago, but it may feel like a very long time if you have been holding gold since then and waiting for a recovery.

# Wonjongkam fails, Peter wins title and the Hayemaker scores

he weekend of March 8 and 9, chock-full of world-title bouts and thrills and spills, was by far the busiest so far in 2008.

Tokyo, Japan: There is an old axiom that states, "Styles make fights." However, the respective styles of flyweights Pongsaklek Wonjongkam (67-3-1, 35 KOs) and Daisuke Naito left the boxing purists wondering who actually came up with this adage.

Wonjongkam, a southpaw, previously held the World Boxing Council (WBC) world flyweight championship for more than six years.


During that period he used pinpoint accuracy, defensive skills and unflagging stamina to dominate the division.

Naito employs an ugly style. He is devoid of technical boxing skill and totally dependent on his own stamina and a Kamikaze, go-for-broke mentality. His lack of power and sloppy style makes him painful to watch.

Yet he somehow managed to become the WBC's world champion in July of last year, scoring the upset win over Wonjongkam, who is fast approaching 40.

Saturday night in Tokyo, Naito again out-hustled the Thai, scoring a draw to retain his title. Both fighters kept up a brisk pace throughout the fight. Wonjongkam scored repeatedly with his straight left. Naito, with his aggression, occasionally got a punch through – but more often missed wildly, sometimes comically.

In the end, the bout was

declared a split-decision draw, effectively ending not only Wonjongkam's reign as the flyweight champion, but Thailand's stranglehold on the division.

Wonjongkam looked excellent defensively, however he was unable to pull the trigger when necessary – a sure sign that age has begun to get the better of him.

Cancun, Mexico: Nigeria's Samuel Peter (30-1, 23 KOs) did exactly what he was supposed to, knocking out Russia's Oleg

Maskaev (34-6, 26 KOs) in six rounds to win the WBC world heavyweight title.

For five rounds, the pair danced and held and occasionally let their hands go.

Finally, when Peter decided to throw more than one of two punches at a time, he floored the big Russian, ending the bout. At 39 years old, Maskaev's career looks to be over.

On the undercard, Nate Campbell (32-5-1, 25 KOs) turned in the performance of his

life to win a split decision over Juan Diaz (33-1, 17 KOs), battering the previously unbeaten lightweight champion and claiming three belts in the process.

Diaz suffered a bad cut over his left eye and brutalized in the later portion of the bout. He'll need plastic surgery to repair his eye and one has to wonder how he will come back after being on the receiving end of such a beating.

London, England: Britian's David Haye (21-1, 20 KOs) proved he's got what it takes to be boxing's next superstar, destroying Welshman Enzo Maccarinelli (28-2, 21 KOs) in the second round by TKO. Haye held the WBA and WBC titles, Maccarinelli the WBO title. Both fought out of the UK and both possessed some serious one-punch knockout power.

Haye has quickly built his reputation as someone who not only talks the talk, but also walks the walk. In his five-year career, he's already defeated Alexander Gurov, Glen Kelly, and in November of last year, Jean-Marc Mormeck – all by KO.

Maccarinelli was trained by Enzo Calzaghe, *Ring* magazine's trainer of the year and father of super middleweight champion of the world Joe Calzaghe. It ended as most expected – by knockout. Both fighter's landed strong punches in the first round, but it was Haye who landed the big punch in round two, his "hayemaker," dropping Maccarinelli.

The Welshmen rose at the count of eight, but was clearly wobbly and unable to continue. Haye now plans to move up to the heavyweight division.

Fight of the month: Former WBA world champion Somsak Sithchatchawal (56-2-1, 44 KOs) and Poonsawat Kratingdaenggym (32-1, 22 KOs) go head-to-head in Rajadamnern Stadium, Bangkok, on March 24 to determine who will be next in line for a world title shot against Panama's Celestino Caballero.

Every so often, the best Thais in the same division meet. This is one such encounter, promising to be a cracker for as long as it lasts. Sithchatchawal scored a huge upset over Mahyar Monshipour in 2006 to win the world title only to lose it in his first defense against Caballero.

Kratingdaenggym challenged for title in 2006, dropping a decision to bantamweight champion Vladimir Sidorenko.

#### Kids set for first Island Trophy







# Patong sidewalk nears completion



Pedestrians in Patong will have to put up with a cluttered sidewalk for only a few more weeks, when repavement is expected to be completed.

PATONG: Work to repave the sidewalk along Sawadirak Rd, from Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd to the Patong beach road, is expected to be complete by mid-March.

Suchatree Boonrit, a civil engineer at Patong Municipality Public Works Department, told the *Gazette* that the sidewalk is being repaved to make it safer for pedestrians as parts of it, including concrete blocks and drain covers, have been missing since the area was damaged by the tsunami.

The 1.338 million baht project is now 90% complete, he said. When complete the sidewalk will be 1.9 meters wide, 660 meters long and cover a total area of 1,254 square meters.

The repaving was due to start on November 8 and was expected to be complete by February 5. However, the project is behind schedule due to construction contractor JRM Engineering Construction Co Ltd not commencing work until about a month after the agreed start date.

As a result of the delay JRM Engineering Construction has had to pay daily fines of 1,338 baht since the agreed completion date, K. Suchatree said



PATONG: Developer Modern Architecture & Design Co Ltd announced that construction on View Talay, a 4-story apartment building on Soi Phra Barami Soi 3 in Patong, is now 90% complete with a grand opening scheduled for March 18.

Construction of the Patong hillside development began in January, 2007. The building is 18 meters above sea level comprising a total of 14 apartment units that will offer residents a 180-degree views of Patong Bay.



## Fusion villa has best of both worlds



#### ince opening in Novemdistraction to drivers along the winding coastal road. And those who venture inside are treated to a minimalist, intimate atmosphere

He did, however, manage to transform the venue into a twolevel, 76-seat restaurant and 52seat bar that feels cozy but not crammed.

As usual with designer-client relations, there was some push and pull throughout the design and construction process. "White is the main theme," K. Nathapol said, "but Marc wanted to have some blue color." In the


end, K. Nathapol convinced Marc to stick with white for a more dramatic contrast to the blue sea backdrop.


White also helped create a look of space in the small, lowceilinged layout. Details of cubes and lines on the interior walls add texture without weighing down or darkening the room.

In the upstairs bar, a cover set in a steel roof structure can be folded back or pulled over the space to suit the weather conditions.

The main level is partitioned to create semi-private, intimate spaces, while the upstairs is open and airy, with no patterns on the walls – framing the sea views as a main focus point. "We don't need it to be more outstanding than the sea," said K. Nathapol.

# Herbal hippie bug blasters

ippies annoy me. Sorry if that offends any hippies reading this, but you are irritating. Actually, it's unlikely that they would shell out some of the money they don't have for this paper, plus I don't think it's printed on unbleached paper produced from 100% renewable sources.

Hippies aren't exactly difficult to identify. Just look for the white quasi-Rastafarian standing around with a vacant expression. The glazed look is often brought on by the inhalation of rather special herbal mixtures, rather than the discovery of internal harmony and tranquility.

What is it with them? Dreadlocks, perhaps combined with any variation on the theme of unwashed hair? Why do they feel compelled to survive on a diet of lentils? They're horrid. The lentils aren't good, either. Far be it from me to generalize, but these people are more than a little "far out".

What's most annoying about them is that most of their accusations of what's wrong with the world are right – in principle, at least. I hate to admit it, but there is one area in which hippies have a point – growing plants naturally. În the west, organic farming, has become more fashionable recently and for a very good reason. Fruit and vegetables grown with no additives, shielded from the spray of pesticides, are infinitely more palatable than their commercial contemporaries.

I'm with the hippies when it comes to chemical pesticides. I would much rather hack off a bug-infested branch than spray it with toxic nastiness.

Recent figures show global pesticide use has increased 5,000% since 1950, with 2.5 million tonnes of industrial, chemical pesticides used worldwide each year. It's inevitable that these pesticides pollute the land in all sorts of unknown ways. They collect into chemical cocktails, combinations of which nobody can predict or prevent from seeping into water tables and the oceans. Only time will tell if the damage can be repaired.

A modern approach is to move towards more appropriate use, and the reduction, of chemical pesticides and to develop natural pesticides. There are a number of trees and herbs that occur naturally, which can be blended

into natural insecticides. Keep in mind, although a pesticide may be organic, it can still harm beneficial insects.

There are some extremely effective natural and herbal pest control methods, many involving nothing more than a few leaves or vegetables.

Caterpillars can be a problem – I've seen the fat green ones with a fake eye on their rear ends consume every leaf on a plant overnight. The cure for caterpillars is the least technical method of garden pest control: pick them off the plant and remove them from the garden. Wear gloves for hairy caterpillars, as the hairs can irritate the skin or worse.

Garlic and red pepper spray

both work well for moth caterpillars. Cut up and mash an unpeeled onion and an un-peeled head of garlic. Drop them into a saucepan and pour in a liter of water. Add one heaped tablespoon of red pepper to the mix. Cook for about 20 minutes on low heat and let cool.

Pour the goo into glass jars (not metal) and seal with a lid. It will keep in the refrigerator for about a month. When you are ready to apply the herbal spray, use a couple of tablespoons of water per liter. You'll find that it kills aphids, mosquitoes and onion flies. It will stink a bit (well, a lot), but it keeps the bugs away.

Basil is brilliant. In addition to being a tasty spice, it's also an effective repellent and larvicide for mites, aphids and mosquitoes; a growth inhibitor for milkweed bugs; and a fungicide.


From the little I know about natural pesticides, it would seem that neem is the ultimate. I'm not sure if it's available in Phuket, but it should be, as it's common all over Asia and Africa.

Although all parts of the tree act as insect repellent, its seed extract is an exceptional repellent and feeding deterrent for a broad range of agricultural and household insects. Unlike most insecticides, the seed extracts appear to be nontoxic to humans and animals, and are essentially nonpoisonous to plants.

Well, I started off having a go at hippies, at which point they probably stopped reading their recycled, six-month old copy of the Gazette. Let's keep my mutual agreement (at least in part) with these people a little secret between ourselves, shall we? Please. They're still annoying.
