Land Office chief indicted over encroachment

PHUKET (TNA, Gazette): Just one day after Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit slammed the Phuket office of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MNRE) for not reporting cases of encroachment, a complaint was filed against Land Department Director Chairerk Dissaya-amnaj for failing to cancel a Chanote land title deed issued on 21 rai of mangrove forest in Rassada Village 3.

Monthon "Palad Rambo" Chartsuwan, an MNRE officer in charge of law enforcement issues, along with residents of Village 3, filed their complaint with Phuket City Police on March 29.

Several government agencies and Phuket MNRE officials had previously concluded that the disputed land is mangrove forest under Royal protection and that a Chanote title deed should never have been issued to former Interior Ministry Permanent Secretary Anan Anantakul in 1984. The deed was later passed onto K. Anan's family, he said.

Citing examples of deforestation and encroachment across the island, Gov Niran on March 28 criticized the Phuket office of the MNRE for failing to report any encroachment or make arrests, despite evidence that encroachment was continuing in some areas.

Speaking at the monthly meeting of the Phuket Provincial Security Committee, Gov Niran urged all agencies to step up the fight against illegal occupation and use of government land. He also called for better efforts to pro-

tect national forest, conservation land and other natural resources from exploitation.

The Phuket Provincial Forestry Office reported that 26 illegally felled logs were seized from protected forest land in the Nakkerd Hills and there was evidence of continued destruction of mangrove forest along the banks of the Bang Chee Lao canal, site of the disputed 21 rai, and Tha Chin canal, also in Rassada.

No suspects have been apended, the governor said.

Noting that such encroachment is often organized and paid for by influential investors, Gov Niran ordered the Phuket MNRE office to seek assistance from the provincial administration's environmental protection unit if they found themselves incapable of fulfilling their duties on their own.

However, Paitoon Panchaiyaphum, chief of the Marine and Coastal Resource Conservation Center Region 4 Office in Phuket, reported that Phuket's marine and coastal resources were receiving adequate protection by his agency.

The center had received good co-operation from the dive industry and tourism-related businesses in monitoring protected areas, he said.

The office dispatches paboats 15 days a month to prevent fishing within the three-kilometer exclusion zone, and other illegal activities, K. Paitoon said.

The agency is also working to create artificial reefs and minimize damage to coral reefs by installing moorings at dive sites so dive boats will not need to anchor, he said.

Gov Niran vows to stamp out underage prostitution

PHUKET: Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit has ordered Kathu Police Superintendent Col Grissak Songmoonnak, Kathu District Chief Khantee Silapa and Patong Municipality officials to work together to immediately put a stop to underage girls working as prostitutes on the island.

The order follows recent sweeps of nightlife entertainment venues in Phuket as part of a crackdown ordered by Interior Minister Chalerm Yoobumrung. The raids turned up girls younger than 15 working as prostitutes at karaoke bars in Phuket City and Patong.

Governor Niran confirmed that "underage prostitutes" were discovered in Patong in late Feb-

"During the crackdown on entertainment venues in Patong staying open after the 2 am closing time, police found a number of Thai females younger than 15 working as prostitutes," he said.

Gov Niran did not reveal the names and locations of the bars or how many child prostitutes they employed.

Police reported that some of the girls had been brought to Phuket to work as prostitutes, making the issue one of human trafficking, said Gov Niran.

Last week, Phuket Provincial Chief Administrative Officer (Palad) Piya Bharatasilpin said that one establishment on Phun Pol Rd Soi 11 in Phuket City, where there are a number of "massage parlors", had been closed after a girl younger than 15 was found working there.

New airport chief announces expansion plans

MAI KHAO: An increase of almost 16% in passenger throughput at Phuket International Airport (PIA) has prompted the announcement of plans to expand airport facilities to support up to 15 million arrivals and departures a year by 2011.

During a press conference held at PIA offices, PIA Director Wing Commander Wicha Nernlop said that the airport recorded 2.84 million arrivals and departures between October 2007 and February 2008, a 15.82% increase on the same period the previous year.

There were 5.5 million arrivals and departures at the airport in the fiscal year October 2006 to September 2007, he added.

"PIA can currently handle up to six million passengers a year, but the increasing number of visitors means facilities must be improved," K. Wicha said.

Initial plans include expansion of parking facilities by 12,500 square meters, which will provide 328 additional car-parking spaces and another 200 spaces for motorcycles, at a cost of 20 million baht, he said.

Current facilities, spread over 26,000sqm, comprise 366 car-parking spaces and 77 spaces for buses, he added.

A budget has yet to be finalized for new terminal buildings, which will take about three years to complete, he said.

Work on improving public facilities - toilets in particular is already underway, he added.

"PIA only has 1,300 rai at its disposal, limiting the scope of possible expansion," said K. Wicha.

"There are two limousine companies operating at the airport, which gives customers a choice, but we are in discussions with the limousine operators to find ways of improving their service," he added.

'Bogus cops' slay Burmese in failed extortion

KATHU: A Burmese laborer was executed by a shotgun blast to the face on the night of March 30 after refusing to pay money demanded by two Thai men posing as undercover police officers, Tung Tong's police chief has told the Gazette.

Tung Tong Distict Police Superintendent Col Arayapan Pukbuakhao on March 31 identified the victim as So Sung, 25, a construction worker living at a workers' camp on the road that runs along the northern boundary of Loch Palm Golf Course.

The murder was reported to police about 10 pm by Akasak Hemklang, owner of the

Ltd, which has been contracted to build a project in the area.

Witnesses said two well-built men covered with tattoos arrived at the camp on a small motorbike. Identifying themselves as off-duty police officers, they demanded money from workers, Col Arayapan explained.

After collecting 190 baht from one woman and 500 baht from another, So Sung emerged from his room and told his fellow workers not to pay because the pair were only students, not real police, Col Arayapan

This enraged the men, one of whom shot

construction company Muang Ake Built Up So Sung in the face and neck before fleeing, he added.

> His body was sent to Patong Hospital for examination.

> Police artists are working on composite sketches based on witnesses' descriptions to track down the pair, Col Arayapan said.

Initial evidence suggests that the culprits were professional gangsters and not students, he said.

Police have begun showing eyewitnesses photos of possible suspects in the case, Col Arayapan added.

Post office sting nets 10,000 ya bah pills

PHUKET CITY: Phuket Police intercepted a package containing 10,000 ya bah (methamphetamine) pills with an estimated street value of 5 million baht at the Phuket City Post Office on March 21.

The seizure came after the arrest the day before of two men in Phuket City for possession of illegal firearms, Region 8 Police commander Lt Gen Thanee Thawisri announced at a press conference on March 24.

Gen Thanee said that Phuket natives Sorrapong "Aod" Phadungkarn, 30, and Pathitta Mathong, 23, were in possession of two automatic handguns, a modified rifle and about 160 rounds of ammunition.

Police also seized bank account books and deposit slips as evidence of transactions worth 7 million baht, he added.

On March 20, undercover narcotics agents received a tipoff that Aod and Pathitta were awaiting a large shipment of ya bah pills to arrive via Thailand Post's express mail service, said Gen Thanee.

At 9 pm that day, a team of officers led by Phuket City Pol

Lt Col Pongnarin Suthin searched the couple's residence at 207 Wandee Apartments in Rassada, where officers found the cache of weapons, bank slips and bankbooks, said Gen Thanee.

During interrogation, the suspects said that a package containing ya bah sent from Northern Thailand would arrive at the Phuket City Post Office the next morning, he said.

At 9:30 am on March 21, officers retrieved a large cardboard box from Aod's postal box. Inside was a plastic container of fermented fruit and a second container of ya bah pills in blue bags.

A total of 50 bags, each containing 200 pills, were seized.

Police suggested the fermented fruit was used to conceal the drug's scent.

Man stabbed to death in Soi Romanee

PHUKET CITY: A sound technician tidying up after a jazz event in the popular tourist street Soi Romanee was stabbed to death early on March 31 after a reported "misunderstanding".

Lt Col Adul Nirapai of Phuket City Police said that police received a call at 2:10 am, reporting that a man had been stabbed in Soi Romanee.

"We arrived to find Komkrit Koysomboon crying, standing over the body of his friend 45vear-old Sanit Pumsuwan, from Samut Prakan," Lt Col Adul said.

"Komkrit was walking across the road to place a keyboard outside his house when a gang of motorcyclists sped past just in front of him.

"He swore at the motorcyclists after they had passed, but three men drinking in a pickup parked nearby thought that he was swearing at them,

"An argument started and Sanit came to help Komkrit. Sanit pulled out a knife and pointed it at the three men. They began fighting and Sanit was stabbed with his own knife," he said.

"Sanit was stabbed 11 times in the chest and down his left side. He bled to death.

"We are still searching for the three men," Lt Col Adul said.

Murder fugitive arrested in Patong

PATONG: Kathu Police took into custody on the night of March 27 a fugitive wanted for murder and other crimes committed in Samut Prakan in December 2006.

Kathu Police Inspector for Investigations Lt Col Chalermchai Hernsawat identified the suspect as Kriengkrai "Krieng" Saelee, 26, a native of Tambon Paknam, Muang District, Samut Prakan.

Kriengkrai was arrested about 10:30 pm while selling clothes at a stall at the Ko Kaew outdoor market on Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd, near Jungceylon.

The Samut Prakan Criminal Court issued an arrest warrant for Kriengkrai on January 4 this year for charges of murder, attempted murder, illegal possession of a firearm and ammunition, and discharging a firearm in public, Lt Col Chalermchai said.

The arrest warrant was distributed to police nationwide after the suspect fled Samut Prakan, he said.

Kriengkrai moved to Patong to live with relatives who owned a clothing stall at the Ko Kaew Market, Lt Col Chalermchai

a press conference on March 30 that Krieng was wanted for the shooting murder of a 14-year-old girl in the waning hours of 2006.

Maj Pakpum Hoyai of Samut Prakan Muang District Police identified Krieng's victim as Ketsaraporn Chuenban, a student at Haad Ammara School in Samut Prakan at the time of her murder.

Maj Pakpum told the Gazette that many of the victim's relatives and friends had attended the event to see the man who had taken Ketsaraporn's life. Among them was the victim's mother, Ketsanee Munmom, 41.

Crying and overcome with rage, she attacked Krieng and slapped him in the face several times before police were able to pull her away, Maj Pakpum said.

On the night of December 31, 2006, Ketsaraporn, her boyfriend and other New Year's Eve revelers were preparing to ring in 2007 in front of her home in Tambon Thai Ban Mai, Muang District, Samut Prakan, he explained.

About 11:30 pm, Krieng and three male friends arrived at the home on motorcycles.

The gang had been fighting with members of a rival gang who were also celebrating at the victim's home, Maj Pakpum said.

Riding pillion, Krieng opened fire with a short-barrel shotgun. Ketsaraporn was killed and two of her friends, both male students from her school, were injured, he added.

The other three men were arrested and charged, but Krieng managed to escape and fled to Phuket. He had been living in Phuket for about a year before his capture, he said.

Maj Pakpum named the other three men as Kunapan "Pom" Hemsuwan, 20; Vitun "Ko" Pon-Eim, 37; and Pornthep Mee-Sri. 31.

Marriott's Courtyard ablaze

PATONG: Crowds gathered on Ruamjai Rd on the afternoon of March 28 as flames engulfed the corner section of The Courtyard hotel, formerly known as the Grand Tropicana Phuket and now owned by Marriott.

"The fire started about 2 pm and took firefighters about 30 minutes to put out," Kathu Police Superintendent Col Grissak Songmoonnak told the Gazette.

'We believe that a spark from workers carrying out construction might have ignited insulation and started the fire," he said.

"We have no more information at this time. We are still investigating the cause of the fire. It is too early to put a value on the extent of the damage," Col Grissak added.

The Phuket Grand Tropicana hotel made headlines in February last year after several guests contracted legionnaires' disease, which was found in the hotel's cooling system.

Sweden mulls issuing travel warnings

PHUKET CITY: The Swedish ready taken such measures. "We Embassy in Bangkok is considering posting warnings on its website advising Swedish women of potential dangers when traveling in Thailand.

The move comes after a number of sexual assaults and killings of female foreign tourists in recent years, most recently the stabbing murder of 26-year-old Swedish tourist Hanna Backlund on March 15 at Mai Khao Beach.

"We are considering posting a general warning on our website addressing the dangers one faces when traveling in Thailand," said General Consul Christina Palm from the Swedish Consulate in Phuket.

"Female travelers in particular should maintain a high state of personal awareness during their time in Thailand," the warning states.

Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit was recently quoted as saying Miss Backlund's murder had hurt Phuket's reputation.

Tourism is the biggest earner of foreign money for Thailand, bringing in more than US\$16 billion in 2007.

Other violent attacks against


years include the rape of a 12year-old girl and the attempted rape of a woman, both on Koh Samui in January 2006.

Trash: A big problem

ith a multitude of unregistered inhabitants in Phuket and growing numbers of tourist arrivals to the province, garbage has reached unmanageable volumes with which the island is struggling to cope.

The sole existing incinerator located in Saphan Hin cannot keep up with high demand and does not have the capacity to burn the vast quantities of garbage produced on the island.

The incinerator can burn up to 250 tonnes of garbage a day,

far short of Phuket's daily garbage generation of about 520 tonnes daily.

Waste that is not burned is piled behind the incinerator in landfills next to water-retention ponds.

This practice has already wreaked an environmental catastrophe.

Last June, toxic effluent from the retention ponds leaked into nearby mangrove forests and into Khlong Koh Kui and Khlong Koh Phee, killing large

quantities of farmed fish and other marine life there.

The problem is predicted to

timate that up to 1,000 tonnes of garbage generated per day by 2013.

> Comprehensive studies into the investment of a second incinerator at the plant have already been conducted, but approval was never granted by the military-installed government.

Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit said in October last year that the proposal would likely be approved after national elections in December, but so far it remains in limbo.

To fill the gap, local government administra-

tions and the private sector have therefore introduced a number of local waste-reduction plans and

A tale of two cities

Therng Talay and Patong are among the island's fastestgrowing areas and both are suffering huge trash-management headaches.

In Cherng Talay, Tawat Rojthanapong, director of Health and Environment of Cherng Talay Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor), said that only about 10,000 residents are registered in the area, but the actual number of people working and living there is triple that amount.

Foreign workers, workers from other provinces and hotel employees who move there from other districts have created a growing demand for accommodation, bars and restaurants in recent years, he said.

This, in turn, has attracted construction workers, creating an increase in the number of construction camps.

"We collect 30 to 35 tonnes of garbage daily, or 950 tonnes monthly," K. Tawat explained.

"Last December, which is the peak period for tourists visiting Phuket, we collected a whopping 980 tons. Four or five years ago the number was about 10 tonnes daily."

About half of the waste is organic, while 20% to 25% is glass bottles.

A glass-recycling program operational.

ister Anongwan Thepsuthin presided over the launch of the glass program together with the Phuket Provincial Administration Office (OrBorJor), the Cherng Talay OrBorTor, the Development of Environment and Energy Foundation (DEE), and the Department of Environmental Quality Promotion.

"We made a deal with Bangkok Glass to come and remove the glass for delivery to Bangkok, but not enough glass has built up yet because we just started the project two months ago," he said.

Cherng Talay will host another waste-reduction facility, an *OrBorJor* project to transform

Back in Patong, however, the garbage problem has already reached "crisis levels", said Wirat Jinda, director of Patong Municipality's Health and Environment department.

He said that the number of residents registered as living in Patong is 18,087, but the real figure is closer to 50,000.

In the tourist season, this number jumps to about 100,000,

in the low season and 80 to 100 tonnes in the high season. Within the next five years, this number is expected to soar to 135 tonnes

"We have never conducted a survey into the makeup of Patong's garbage, but it is believed that bottles pose the largest problem of the different types of waste," he said.

"In the past, no-one seemed interested in collecting the glass waste as it was heavy and cumbersome and generated only small profits – as little as 20

satang per kilo-gram," K. Wirat added.

"Now things are looking up with Bangkok Glass Co expressing interest in collecting the bottles with a view to selling them on.

"Also, the bottle situation improved even further recently with a Phuket-based secondhand shop also showing interest in taking the glass off our hands," he said.

Garbage is currently collected twice daily by 16 garbage trucks and separated by garbage

workers before being delivered to the incinerator in Saphan Hin.

"We allow the garbage workers to keep the things that they think they can sell themselves, because they receive only a modest salary that does not stretch far in a place like Phuket," K. Wirat said.

A Patong-based incinerator is out of the question due to prohibitive land costs for such a faPatong's waste-management system by distributing plastic garbage bags in 10 colors, each designated for a particular category of waste, was announced in September last

The project has yet to get off the ground, due to lack of budget. There are also concerns about how the multitude of bins required would appear in a tourism area.

Another plan, still in its infancy, has recently been launched. Over the past four months, Patong Municipality has

> been using a garbage-convertor machine courtesy of the Industry Engineering Club (Chomlom)UsahakamKreungjakol) that transforms food waste into materials used to make dishwashing liquid, glass, plastic and construction materials.

In addition to more facilities, better environmental education is needed, said K. Wirat. Unauthorized dumping of construction waste and people's

tendency to ignore rules on littering are adding to the problem, he added.

"I have been to Malaysia and Singapore on educational garbage-management tours and I'm very impressed with both countries and the fact that people seem to respect the littering laws," he said.

"Thai people don't. We have the wrong kind of attitude.

The circle game

While local governments struggle to get their wastemanagement systems up to speed, little is happening at the national level to support their efforts.

Governor Niran said back in October that alternatives to central government support have been sought.

"If the central government does not approve funding for another incinerator, the private sector may then be offered the chance to tackle the island's garbage-disposal problems instead,"

If this is the case and the private sector is prepared to invest, then sections of the Public-Private Investment Act will have to be changed, said Governor

Multi-million-baht plans for alternative garbage-disposal solutions have already been submitted by PTT and Ecco, which were outlined in the signing of an MOU between the Ministry of Energy, Phuket Province and British renewable-energy company Sepco, Gov Niran explained.

Sepco has already surveyed the Phuket incinerator area and said that it would be able to dispose of the garbage in the 128rai landfill, turning it into a green zone and public area using modern garbage-disposal technology from the UK.

Even if this plan goes through, it has been widely acknowledged that simply increasing incineration capacity is not a viable long-term solution to Phuket's waste management

While recycling and collection initiatives at the local level should help alleviate trash woes, it is clear that without some big ideas and large-scale government backing, these will prove to be band-aid solutions to a growing environmental crisis.

Burglar busted during cat nap

NAKHON SRI THAMMARAT: In most professions, apart from those involving heavy machinery or driving perhaps, falling asleep on the job will earn you a strict telling off, a warning letter or in the worst case, the sack.

In the burglary trade, however, sleeping on the job can have somewhat more serious consequences as one young army deserter in Phraphrom District discovered March 27.

Pvt Chanchai Phanrak, 25, who a few days earlier had deserted his unit at their base in Chonburi, was found fast asleep in bed by Chaiwat Phensawat, 22, the son of the owner of the house he was robbing in Village 6 Tambon Naphru.

K. Chaiwat was on his way to the bathroom, when he noticed a strange man sleeping on his sister's bed – his sister was staying with a relative at the time – and her possessions scattered around the room.

Chaiwat crept in for a closer look to make sure the man really was a stranger and then called his father, Prawet Phensawat, 46.

The pair grabbed the sleeping stranger, tied him up and waited for the police.

Police soon arrived to arrest the sleepy trespasser. Police said that Pvt Chanchai confessed that six days before his fateful nap, he had requested a day's leave from his base in Chonburi and then fled back to the South where

he was from.

He also confessed that at the time of his desertion, he had only just been released from military prison where he had been incarcerated on charges of theft.

"Before the incident, I'd been visiting a relative in Maharaj Hospital [in Nakhon Sri Thammarat City]. I then wandered around aimlessly until it was nearly dawn when I came across a house with a window open.

I decided to sneak in and rob the house. When I got into the room, however, I found that the bed was very soft and comfortable. I thought I'd just lie down and shut my eyes for a moment and then make my escape with the things I had stolen. But because I was so tired, I fell fast asleep. The next thing I knew the occupants of the house had me pinned down," Pvt Chanchai lamented.

Lt Col Wutiphong Titisroj, Deputy Superintendent of Phraphrom Police Station, said that Pvt Chanchai had committed at least 10 burglaries and his commanding officer would be notified of his arrest so he could be prosecuted.



Heartbroken man leaps to his death at hotel

PHUKET CITY: A young Thai man was found dead on the morning of March 28 after falling from his 19th floor room at the Royal Phuket City hotel.

Maj Wicharn Suwannasit, Inspector at Phuket City Police Station, said that police received a call at 2 am from hotel staff reporting that a man had been found dead on the fourth-floor outdoor deck of the hotel.

Police identified the man as Charas Srituwanont, 24, from Chonburi. "Charas was dressed in shorts and a brown T-shirt. In his wallet, we found US\$272 and about 3,000 baht. He worked on a cruise liner," Maj Wicharn said.

K. Charas checked in to the hotel on March 27, but the room had been booked in the name of a female friend of his, whom Maj Wicharn declined to name.

"They had dinner in the hotel room but they started arguing because K. Charas said that he loved her, but she said she just wanted to be friends," Maj Wicharn told the *Gazette*.

"She left K. Charas' room about midnight. The last thing he said to her when she was in the elevator was that if she did not love him in this life, then he hoped to see her again in his next life," he added.

"K. Charas and the woman had been friends for about seven years, but they both had their own separate partners," Maj Wicharn said, adding that K. Charas was engaged to be married to another woman.

Police found no evidence of foul play and are treating the death as a suicide, Maj Wicharn

Police nab motorcycle thief

PHUKET CITY: A prolific motorcycle thief has been charged with stealing four motorbikes in Phuket within a four-week period.

At about 5 pm on March 23, a police officer spotted Nakhon Ratchasima native Sankom Kraiam, 21, by the side of the road outside Soi Tawee Sup in Wichit removing a number plate from a Honda Click motorcycle, said Phuket City Police Superintendent Col Nos Svettalekha.

The officer approached Sankom and radioed Phuket City Police Station, officers there confirmed that the plate number and bike description matched that of a motorcycle reported stolen at 11 pm the night before, he added.

The bike had been stolen from outside the owner's home in Rassada, he said.

Sankom was arrested at the scene and taken to Phuket City Police Station, where he confessed to stealing the Honda Click and three other motorcycles in Phuket, Col Nos added.

Sankom told police that earlier in March he had stolen a

Honda Click from Koh Sireh and a Kawasaki Neon that he had hidden behind a tree in Saphan Hin, only for it to be discovered by a passerby who then alerted Phuket City Police, Col Nos said.

On March 22, Sankom stole a black Suzuki Step in Wichit, he added.

"He would look for an unlocked motorcycle parked outside a house and wheel it out of sight. Sankom would then go and make a counterfeit key at his home so that he could return to the bike and ride away on it. He would either keep the bike or sell it for 3,000 baht," said Col Nos.

Sankom, who was released from Kathu Police Station in December last year for stealing mobile phones in Patong, has been charged with robbing at nighttime, which carries harsher punishments than robbing during the day, said Col Nos.

He is being detained at Phuket City Police Station, he said.

The bikes are being held by Phuket City Police while the investigation continues, he added.

nusual weather patterns for this time of year, with heavy rain each afternoon, have shattered dreams of most Khao Lak-based businessmen who hoped to cash in during the Easter spike in tourist numbers before the wet season begins.

This year, however, the wet season came more than a month early. This is mind boggling, especially as the previous wet season was so long and heavy. The rain in March was so heavy that most visitors to Khao Lak were confined to their resorts and dined at resort restaurants.

Hardest hit were local dive shops, receiving many cancelations and complaints, especially when visibility at the Similans Islands dropped to an all-time low after a storm at the end of March.

After the storm, visibility as short as five meters was reported – a nightmare for any Similanslover knowing that visibility of up to 50 meters is possible.

The slippery roads caused several traffic accidents in and around Khao Lak.

Local drivers still find it unnecessary to switch on their headlights when heavy rain impairs visibility. At least two motorists were killed in the center of Khao Lak in March.

guardrail at the first curve near Khao Lak beach, on the southern half of Lamru National Park, has been destroyed after weekly incidents of cars and trucks slamming into it.

Until the end of 2007, the local OrBorTor replaced that part

of rail on a monthly basis, but any interest in doing so now is gone.

Khao Lak-lovers need not worry, however, because in contrast to destinations such Krabi, where all development is concentrated around a single beach, Khao Lak's 120-kilometer-long coastline provides enough space to cater for the upcoming tourism boom without making it as overcrowded as Patong and Pattaya.

Easy Rider. On March 7 and 8, Bang Niang Beach was host to Khao Lak's first Bike Show, which was a lighter version of the annual Phuket Bike Week. The event was organized by K. Damon, owner of Badgers Biker Bar, located on Petchkasem Rd halfway between Nang Thong

In appreciation of the forthcoming event, local authorities erected several billboards in Khao Lak that read, "If it's illegal in your country, it's also illegal here!"

Some foreign bikers and even non-biking Khao Lak visitors may have found these boards offensive; the boards inferred that every visiting foreigner and foreign biker were breaking the law.

Organizing Bike Show staff placed "No Drugs" signs all over the area, supporting the official efforts. Instead of offending Khao Lak visitors, the money for the road signs could have been used to educate Thailand's youth about the negative effects of riding tuned-up Honda Dreams recklessly and the prolonged effects of using ya bah (methamphetamine), the latter being a huge problem that has been ignored by Thai officials for more than a decade.

Even though there were some minor glitches in the livemusic part of the show, the event was hailed a success by its organizers, which it clearly was given the short amount of time available for promotion.

Beautifully crafted, custom Harleys and hard-bodied biker babes were all on show, with live music and beer a-plenty.

Nearby restaurants were packed and received a fair slice of the trade.

Expats have their fingers crossed that the event will be repeated next year. Anything that helps boost interest in Khao Lak is a stepping stone towards the beach becoming a leading tourism destination in Thailand.

Dentist gunned down by patient

young dentist was shot dead by a patient in the clinic where she worked in Songkhla's Sadao district on March 22.

Police suspect the patient was actually a hired gunman.

Phichaya Asawasunthornnet, 26, was shot by a patient in the OK Saha Clinic in Daan Nok, a town along the border with Malaysia and home to Thailand's busiest land-border-immigration checkpoint.

Witnesses told police that as Dr Phichaya was turning away from the patient to pick up some dental tools, the patient drew a 9mm pistol and shot her three times in the back before fleeing from the clinic. He escaped in an Izusu DMax pickup truck, they said.

Dr Phichaya was rushed to Sadao Hospital by her boyfriend Purana Lohanawakul, the owner of the clinic.

From there she was transferred to the better-equipped Prince of Songkla University Hospital in Haad Yai, where she died from her wounds.

The gunman registered in the patient's log under the name "Phairoj Seubsai", but a subsequent investigation revealed that no such person exists, police said.

Officers believe the man was a hired gunman.

A personal dispute, possibly linked to the victim's relationship with the owner of the clinic, is likely to have been the motive for the killing, police said.

The clinic owner had been married once before, they noted.

Fish shock. A man was killed while using a live electric cable to shock fish in Songkhla's Singhanakhon District on March 29

Friends rushed 24-year-old Theeraphong Choptang to Song-khla Hospital, where he was pronounced dead on arrival. Doctors established the cause of death as multiple organ failure caused by a massive electric shock.

Hospital authorities notified



Explosive rounds

Police investigating the incident learned that on the morning of his death, K. Theeraphong went fishing with friends in Ban Nong Hoi in Singhanakhon District's Tambon Chingkho.

K. Theeraphong was using a live wire to stun fish in the pond so they would be easy to catch. After he accidentally electrocuted himself, his friends rushed him to hospital, but he died on the way

Malay mystery. A Malaysian tourist was found beaten to death in his room at the Cathay Hotel

in Yala's Betong district on the morning of March 22.

Police were called to the hotel at 10:30 am after cleaners found the victim's body lying on the floor of the room.

The man appeared to be in his mid-forties, police said.

The room showed signs of a violent struggle; furniture was scattered and the walls and bed were splattered with blood.

From the victim's hand, police collected as evidence strands of hair believed to be those of his killer.

The victim checked into the hotel on March 21 with four other Malaysian men, hotel staff told police.

Shortly before midnight, guests heard a violent argument in Room 207 and a hotel security guard went to ask the men to keep the noise down.

At 8:30 am the next morning, four of the men checked out. A cleaning woman said that one of the men told her not to clean room 207 just yet as their friend was still sleeping. Reception staff told police that the group seemed in an unusual hurry to leave.

After being informed of the killing, the police alerted officers at all border crossings to keep a watch out for the four Malaysians. The body of the victim was taken to Betong Hospital

for autopsy

Police suspect the victim was killed after having an argument with his companions.

Teachers flee. More than 200 teachers in government schools in four border districts of Songkhla province have sought transfer out of the area, a senior education official said on March 28.

Soljai Wibulkij, director of Songkhla Education Service Area 3 office, said the teachers stated their wish to be transferred out of the districts at the end of the school year.

Some wanted to work in schools close to their families, while others want to be transferred out of the violence-stricken areas, K. Soljai said.

Forest fears. National-park officials are worried that the insurgency in the Deep South may be contributing to the depletion of the area's forestland and biodiversity.

Last year, rangers at The 340-square-kilometer Budo-Sungai Padi National Park reported 13 arrests for illegal logging with seizure of hundreds of cubic metres of hardwood timber.

Park Superintendent Sitthichai Madsri said the arrests represent only a tiny fraction of loggers who have invaded the park, which encompasses the range of hills that stretches through the provinces of Pattani, Yala and Narathiwat.

"Entering the forest is like entering 'no man's land'. It is too dangerous to send in rangers as we don't know who is who. We only have old shot guns while they carry modern weaponry," K. Sitthichai said.

"We dare not even ask security officers to fly in patrol helicopters because of the high risk of being shot down."

oys who want to change sex by having their testicles surgically removed should think again, experts have warned. The warning follows a complaint by gay activist Nathee Theerarojjanaphon to the Medical Council that a 16-year-old boy in Chiang Mai province had his testicles removed and his two friends, aged 14 and 15, were also seeking to have the operation.

Removing their testicles could make their complexion and body look like that of a woman, the boys believed.

Dr Supachai Kunaratanapruk, chief of the Public Health Ministry's Department of Health Service Support Department, said there is no scientific evidence that removing a boy's testicles can change his sexual appearance and complexion.

Instead of looking beautiful, boys would face dangerous sideeffects and risk having to take hormone drugs for the rest of their lives, she said.

Most sex-change operations for male teenagers in Thailand have been done by legal and illegal clinics in Bangkok, Chiang Mai and Phuket, she added.

The clinics use websites to advertise the operations, which cost 4,000 to 5,000 baht.

Dr Supachai said that most operations are of poor standard and dangerous.

Medical Council secretarygeneral Amnat Kulasanant said his agency will charge any physicians who perform sex-change operations on boys under 18 without parental consent.

Conniving to be cops. There were 161 cases of cheating reported by would-be police cadets sitting the annual Royal Thai Police entry exam, which were taken by nearly 100,000 applicants, said Deputy national police spokesman Pol Maj Gen Ruengsak Jaritek.

Total scores, individual scores and amount of right and wrong answers were exactly the same among the 161 cheats, he said.

When the cheats were asked to retake the exam, the results varied widely, he added.

For love or money. Many women in Isarn are paying large sums to matchmaking agencies in the hope of finding foreign husbands.

In January, one agency in Khon Kaen allegedly took more than 10 million baht from local women looking for well-to-do farangs, said Lt Col Verravoot Siangsai of the Khon Kaen Muang District Police.

Some agencies charge up to 70,000 baht for introductions and a chance to meet after a series of online chats.

If a couple introduced to each other by an agency marry, the agency charges another 50,000 baht, plus 10% of the dowry paid by the foreign groom, he said.

About 50 women made complaints about several agencies in January, but only one filed

an official complaint because the rest were too embarrassed, he said

"Not all foreigners agree to marry the women after they meet. Some men came just to have sex," he noted.

Sonic boom. Seven people were injured in Samut Prakan when a truck's natural gas cylinder exploded while being filled at a PTT gas station on Bang Na-Trat Rd about 12:30 am on March 30.

Police suspected that the tank might have been defective or the staff tried to overfill it.

Injured were two gas station workers, the drivers of two other vehicles, the station owner and two staff of the gas station convenience store. Most of them suffered ear injuries.

Splashing out. The Public Health Ministry wants to teach as many as 11 million children under 15 years old to swim.

Teaching more children to swim will reduce the number of drownings each year, said Public Health Minister Chaiya Sasomsap, who wants the number of children who die by drowning to fall below 1,200 annually by the year 2010.

The ministry on March 26 launched a project to provide free swimming lessons to 400 children

K. Chaiya said that the leading cause of death in under-15s is drowning. Most victims are between the ages of five to nine and most drownings occur in March and April, when children are on school holidays and the weather is hottest, he said.

Just 16% of approximately 13 million children under 15 know how to swim, he said.

It is an essential skill that will save many lives, he added.

Hot heads. The rising temperatures have seen a correlation in the rising number of patients seeking psychiatric help in Nakhon Ratchasima province.

The number of patients at Nakhon Ratchasima Psychiatric Hospital has risen by 20% since the hot season began, its deputy director, Dr Norachat Rattanachata, said on March 28.

Most patients are over 40 years old. Common symptoms are insomnia, depression, stress and mental disorders, he said.

Passport to prison. Police in Bangkok on March 28 arrested Korean Kim Hoi Sung for allegedly forging passports for sale.

Mr Kim was arrested on Soi Lard Prao 96 at 1:15 pm while delivering false passports to an undercover police officer.

Tourist Police Commander Pol Maj Gen Chuchart Suwannakhom said police seized 63 South Korean and Hong Kong passports from Kim.

Kim said that he had been living in Thailand for seven years and had been hired to forge passports at the rate of 10,000 baht each, police said.

He superimposed pictures of his customers on passports that he bought from South Korea, police said.


Online car tax payment. The Land Transport Department now accepts online payments for vehicle taxes through 10 banks.

The service, which began last week, is expected to welcome payments from 200,000 vehicle owners in its initial stage.

Each year, 27 million cars in Thailand are subjected to road taxes totaling around 16 billion baht.

Sufficiency Economy ucked away on the slopes of Nakkert hills off Chao Fa East Rd, keeps agriculture local an allotment overflows

with indigenous plants, fruit trees, palms and orchids for sale. This is one of Phuket's two Sufficiency Economy agricultural projects supported by the Department of Agricultural Extension under the Ministry of Agriculture. The second project is in Cherng Talay. The project provides a cen-

tral location where locals can turn their home-grown produce into income and agricultural knowledge can be passed on to the community. School children go there on day trips to learn about grassroot economies, while horticulturists come to buy plants, trees and flowers at reasonable prices, including a wide range of indigenous orchids.

Sufficiency Economy is a theory of a self-supporting microeconomy at village level that was conceived by HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej. The phrase "One Tambon One Farm" was coined under the same premise as the better-known "One Tambon One Product" concept.

HM The King's wish was to see a traditional way of communal self-sufficiency maintained that provides sustainable incomes for community members while preserving traditional ways of life, free from the trappings of spiraling debts that many were experiencing as they embraced modern, yet often more-costly and less-sustainable, farming methods.

A small wooden shack on the plot of land is adorned with easy-to-read posters depicting the methods and benefits of following the self-sufficiency initia-

The area is also a resting space for community members and doubles as a conference venue for visiting officials to pass on concepts and methods

of sustainable agriculture.

Among the most striking and colorful plants growing in this hillside garden are the varieties of orchid that have been carefully transplanted onto old wood and hung from trellises.

Many of the orchids hang-

ing there are unique to the area and include varieties that were on the verge of extinction.

In the past, these orchids may have been unscrupulously ripped away from the bark of their host tree in the jungle and sold in city markets, dwindling their presence in their native habitat.

Now the orchids and many other indigenous species of plant have hope of salvation. They are cared for with green fingers and allowed to flourish until they produce new shoots, which are carefully transferred to another pot or piece of wood and allowed to grow on their own.

The project covers almost one rai, which was donated by Nang Sanya Hiranwadee and is under the supervision of project's co-ordinator Watcharee Duangkaew of the Agricultural Office, Phuket City district.

Plants and trees are cheaper here than in commercial nurseries. Orange and lime trees,

well on their way to maturity, are just a few hundred baht and there are several types of palms, ferns and creepers.

The orchids are still highly valued and cost about 1,000 baht for each plant.

One individual who has benefited from the project is K. Wirat, a local rubber tapper. He now has a place close to home where he can offload his raw rubber, for which he earns about 70 baht per kilo – a day's work for K. Wirat. He can also earn more money from the plants he helps to cultivate at the project.

To find this Sufficiency Economy project, take Chao Fa East Rd to Soi Nagkok, opposite the TOT offices.

Follow the road leading up towards the hills for about two kilometers until it turns into a dirt track. On the left, you will see a large, official-looking sign on the left written in Thai and English.

Moods by the water

Mali Waterfront

egular readers of this works effectively. column may recall the Sea Hag restaurant in Patong with its colorful owner, K. Kenya, a few weeks ago. Well, this week we have yet to sprawling on a sofa or prop-

another loosely-African-related eatery in Mali Waterfront, situated lakeside in Karon.

The landlocked country of Mali is one of the poorest in the world, whereas

Mali Waterfront is downright chic. Mali in West Africa features the Niger and Senegal rivers; Mali Waterfront features the nearby dunes of Karon Beach and its large lake.

And that's where the similarities abruptly end.

Mali Waterfront has been open for a little more than two months and its dining area sports a black-and-white theme that

The restaurant is big and bold in concept, with dining and chill-out options ranging from alfresco or covered lakeside-dining

ping up the bar.

A spotlight pierces a silver shaft up into the clear night sky while colorful bead lights wrapped around four recently transplanted palms provide

ambient lighting.

At the far end by the bar is a sand-floored area with sofas and a dance space cleverly illuminated by more string beads, lending the whole place a decidedly cool feel.

Over in the northeast night sky, silvery-gray, post-apocalyptic-like towers of clouds boil and twist, lightning flashing and growling from within. They threaten to

head our way, hesitate, change their mind and then waft over the hillside to Patong to empty themselves on Sin City while we sit and enjoy the cool evening breeze.

It's a full-moon night and every table is reserved, catering to a party slated to start at 11pm. A member of staff points out that Mali Waterfront has been mad busy almost every evening since its opening, so word must have circulated quickly.

The early-evening service (and I don't mean vespers) is exemplary, with lots of smiles and attention. I order, gently pointing out that our five-year-old is ravenous and guess what? He gets his fish and chips within minutes and settles into his food even before I can take a sip from my absolutely minuscule dry martini (160 baht).

My shrimp bisque (80 baht) soon arrives and is deliciously creamy with a juicy great shrimp (dead) pierced by a lemongrass stalk. By now, diners are arriving in droves and all of a sudden the great service begins to falter as orders are taken seemingly faster than the kitchen can handle, or maybe the kitchen's up to speed and the wait staff isn't.

Any way you look at it, after some 20 minutes we get our main dishes, both seafood plates and both cold.

We sip our wine and stoically eat our fish and chips (180 baht) and poached fillet of red snapper with dill cream sauce,

veggies and tasty saffron rice priced at (270 baht).

By now, Mali's almost fullhouse and things are getting a little strained around the edges, but the ubiquitous smile on the waitstaff's faces stays firmly in place.

In spite of the rush, our waiter still has time to give a cuddle to a Scandinavian baby at the next table.

With some 40 labels to choose from, the wine list at Mali Waterfront is capable enough but a word of caution: It's better to choose higher-end labels towards the 2,000-baht level as some of the cheaper ones here are a little compromised and can come back the next day with a nasty bite.

As for the menu, it's not exclusively seafood and even includes an admirable "Phuket Old Town" southern-Thai food section, featuring such local delights as braised pork in sweet-and-soy sauce, as well as other Phuket dishes, along with Italian food, hamburgers and sandwiches. There is also a free salad-bar.

Make no bones about it, this is a tourist venue and as such performs very well, but don't expect haute cuisine, five-star service and piping-hot food served tableside.

Even the aspiring rat chef in the movie Ratatouille acknowledged the difficulty of getting service just right, but somehow I get the impression that roller blades for staff members here – as in the movie – would be a little risqué.

To end the evening, the little lad has a strawberry ice cream (80 baht) and before you know it, it's time to crank the starting handle of the Bentley once again.

It's been a mixed night out but the cheerfulness of the staff overall and the wonderful location at Mali Waterfront have been enough to ensure that it was an enjoyable one.



hen *Pop Idol* burst onto UK television screens in 2001, it ushered in a new era of reality TV that would go on to take many forms around the world, most notably *American Idol*, which is currently in its seventh season. Who could forget the faces of those stars who shot to fame on these programs, such as... Actually, can anyone *remember* any of the stars of that first season?

"It's obviously about entertainment and ratings. There isn't really any substance in it as such; it depends on who works on the shows and what they can give," said Joshua Alamu, who has appeared as a vocal coach on such UK television shows, including *Pop Idol, Dance X* and *X-factor*.

"Working on reality shows was a great experience. It was glamorous on one side, while on the other it was all politics. I enjoyed working with the contestants and developing them, getting them to believe in themselves. I love taking an artist and saying, 'How can we make you better? How can we make you more confident?" said Joshua.

Joshua was in Phuket to hold

Joshua was in Phuket to hold singing and songwriting workshops for students at British International School (BIS). "I've been here for the best part of six

days. What I've been doing is working with the kids in the school with singing and performance. I also did one songwriting workshop," he added.

Born and raised in London, Joshua has family in the UK, as well as Ghana and Nigeria. "I spent three years in Africa. I absolutely adore African music. It's part of who I am, part of my roots. It's influenced the whole world, from jazz to rock," he said.

Playing a prominent role in all of Joshua's vocal coaching is speech-level singing (SLS), a technique that has helped shape the voices of many of the most successful vocalists of the past 50 years. "I work with the Speech-Level Singing organization, which is a worldwide organization, set up by [vocal coach] Seth Riggs, that's based in LA in the US. Mega-stars have trained in this technique, from Kelly Clarkson to Stevie Wonder," said Joshua.

Hoping to bring SLS to Thailand, Joshua was testing the water at BIS with the help of friend and colleague Claire Cornielje, head of visual and performing arts at BIS.

Claire and Joshua plan to build on their workshops and open this level of vocal coaching up to the whole community.

Joshua's first break in the music industry came at an audition also attended by revered vocal coach Carrie Grant and her husband David Grant, who had a string of UK hits in the 1980s and now also works as a vocal coach.

"Carrie heard me sing and gave me work straight away, so I started doing backing vocals for people like Take That, the Spice Girls and Robert Palmer. Then David and Carrie set up a band called United Colors of Sound and they asked me to join. We were signed to Sony, disbanded eight years later and that's when I fell into teaching," he said.

track for a movie called Dark Eden, which will be a trilogy. I've been asked to do all the music for it: the songs, working with the artists. I'll also record some of the songs and write a lot of them myself," he added.



Some scenes from *Dark Eden* will be filmed in Thailand. The low-budget movie will be part martial-arts thriller, part love story and part tragedy. "It's about a soul who discovers who he is," said Joshua.

As a vocal coach who works with singers both signed and unsigned, Joshua has come across a range of talents during his career. "I think everyone can sing. Whether they can sing technically or not is another thing. I can take a bad singer and make them good, take a good singer and make them better or take a great singer and make them fantastic. As long as they're willing to put in hard work, I'm happy to work with them," he said.

Speaking about the current state of pop music, Joshua said, "Now we're looking at people who can really sing and write songs. There are a lot pop bands developing management deals and record deals as we speak," he said.



Keeping a clean sheet in Thailand

he subject of laundries, washing machines and dryers is one that I am involved in regularly in the sale and fitting-out of new properties.

I've been dealing with a lady who is buying a luxury apartment in Phuket and she wanted to know where the washing machine and dryer would go.

I pointed out to her that I had not used a washing machine for 20 years and that, in my opinion, the available space would be better used for wine fridges.

I told her that if I bought a new washing machine and dryer it would cost the same as taking all my clothes to my local laundry lady for about five years.

Once a week I take a basket of laundry and pick up last week's, all freshly washed, ironed and hanging up ready to go straight into my wardrobe.

If I buy a washing machine and dryer, I still have to do the ironing – and that's the worst part.

Sure you can get a maid to do it, but the last time I tried to get my cleaning lady to do the ironing, my girlfriend's best softsatin top finished up with a big hole in the sleeve.

Have you ever tried ironing bed linen? How about the bottom

sheet, the one with the elastic around the edge?

What is it about bedding sets here and why is there never a top sheet, just a bottom sheet with elastic, a couple of pillow cases and a quilt?

The top sheet is the perfect cover in the tropics and protects the quilt from unpleasant, sweaty bodies. When I came here you couldn't find a single sheet – only sets – and only the advent of international supermarkets made it possible to find single sheets.

Apart from that, I have always had an aversion to laundry. I used to help my mother sometimes with her smaller children. That included changing nappies.

You knew you had to change the nappies because the kid became red in the face and then squawked.

Nappies were a big deal then. You had to clean them, rinse them, boil them in copper, rinse them out again, wind them through the mangle and hang them out to dry. Everything else went into the washing machine, which tossed them back and forth until you decided that the water was dirty enough.

You emptied it out and refilled it until the water was clean, put the clothes through the

mangle to squeeze the water out and hung them on a clothesline to dry.

Then came those disposable nappies. Take them off, wrap them up and

throw them in a rubbish bin.

Soon after that, automatic washing-machines and dryers started appearing in people's homes. You didn't need to wash the nappies any more but everything else went in, except perhaps, as they were termed, some ladies' "delicates".

Quite a few delicates got shredded in the older machines and many ladies preferred not to risk their unmentionables, especially the lacy items.

In fact, even here in Thailand, where we have access to cheap laundry services, most ladies prefer to take care of their own unmentionables and delicates.

As I explained to the woman who is buying an apartment: Have the maid or driver take the clothes to a local laundrette.

TALES OF A TRAVELER

f you've seen the movie *Collateral*, starring Jamie Foxx and Tom Cruise, you might remember how Foxx, a cabbie, made his way through the hard times in his life. Clipped to the sun visor in his cab was a photo of a beautiful island. Whenever he was feeling blue or having a less-than-stellar day, he looked at the photo and it took him away from his troubles, helping him remember there is more to life than driving a cab.

Maybe you've thought about it at one time or another: palm trees, white-sand beaches and a crystal-blue sea, sipping on a cold beer and taking it all in. For some, Pattaya is too in your face, Koh Samui and Phuket are too touristy and Hua Hin is just missing that wow-factor.

Maybe you've already been to these places and are looking for a change. Whatever the reason, if you are seeking that perfect getaway, I've got just the place for you – and I'm hesitant to tell you about it. Call me selfish, but I love Koh Chang and want it all for myself.

Ferries between the island and Ao Thammachat Pier on the mainland in Trat run every 30 minutes, from 6:30 am to 7 pm daily. The cost is 120 baht each direction. The trip breezes by and there is food and drink available.

Once you reach the island, take a *songtaew* to your final destination. Fares run between 50 and 80 baht depending on whether you go to White Sand Beach (50 baht) or Lonely Beach (80 baht).

No matter where you decide to go, upon landing you'll be rewarded with breathtaking tropical scenery. The island is about as close to paradise as you will find anywhere on earth. There is just enough development to fulfill your basic needs – yes, there's Internet and cable TV – but the island is still relatively undeveloped.

Whether you're looking for inexpensive bungalows or fourand five-star resorts, there is a full range of accommodation on Koh Chang.

The White Sand area of the

island is the most developed. Klong Prao and Kai Bae beaches have four- and five-star hotels with spectacular sea views. Lonely Beach, while no longer quite as lonely as it once was, has still managed to keep from turning into an overdeveloped tourist-destination. Lonely Beach is

the preferred backpacker destination with unspoiled beaches and low priced-bungalows farther away from the pier than White Sand Beach.

The White Sand area of the island is a great place to take the family. It is quiet but with enough small restaurants and shops to

keep you busy – at least for a few days. You might also choose to do what I did: nothing, except laying on the beach sipping beer.

My stay at the Alina Grand Hotel was what you would expect on an island paradise – perfect. Ek and Dave founded the Alina Hotel and Resort in 1998 and named the hotel after their baby daughter, Alina. The Alina Resort came first, and then eight years later the duo opened the Alina Grande Hotel across the street.

The Alina Resort offers hotel rooms and bungalows equipped with a choice of air conditioning or fan, hot water, refrigerator and cable TV. To top it off you can dine at the beachfront restaurant. Prices start at about 800 baht a night.

The Alina Grande Hotel boasts new rooms with king- or queen-sized beds, balconies and views of the sea and hills. Traditional Thai art graces the establishment and the swimming pool is situated beneath the hills.

As if that is not enough, there is a travel agency and minimarket within the hotel, as well as a patio bar and swimming pool. There are other places to stay in the area – but with an average rate of 1,500 baht per night, you get one of the best deals on the island here.

There are no huge malls or movie theaters on the island, but there is more than enough to do. If you tire of drinking at one of the tiki bars along the beach or gorging yourself with seafood, you can always take a trip to one of the waterfalls on the island.

Than Mayom Waterfall consists of four levels and is the most popular of the waterfalls on Koh Chang. In addition, you can swim in the large pool that rests in front of the falls. Another waterfall worth traveling to is the three-level Klong Plu Waterfall. As with any waterfall you hike to, be careful – the Klong Plu falls are quite slippery and the last thing you need to ruin your holiday is a 50-meter fall.

Koh Chang has good food, affordable accommodation, extraordinary scenery and a laid-back vibe. For those who care, there is a bar scene. It certainly doesn't rival the nightlife of Phuket or Pattaya, but for a semi-deserted tropical island, it's more than enough.

The worst thing about Koh Chang is the trip back to Bangkok.

verybody wants it. Some women would trade their sex appeal for a slice of it. Britain's Posh Spice needs it so bad it hurts. Model Kate Moss has it, and it has been her salvation. I am talking of course, about good taste.

Taste commands serious respect in Western culture and we are reminded daily that it gets you farther than mere good looks, brains or money. In the end it's not very surprising that we are all slavishly engaged in the ongoing struggle to become that woman described as having "fabulous taste". Then again, the crusade has got way, way out of

As a good-taste wannabe – and show me a woman who isn't - I know only too well the extremes of which we are capable.

I have obsessed about Egyptian cotton-crisp white sheets and spent indecent amounts on linen tea towels. I have bought things entirely because someone with OGT – officially good taste -owned them, copied picture-hanging formations and flower arrangements. You may roll your eyes at this, but actually it's all in the detail.

Even worse, I have even uttered the words, "I don't care if they are awful – I just want to see inside their apartment." Taste makes people popular, even if they are terrible human beings.

A touch of taste

But the blind pursuit of good floorboards... taste is not really the problem anymore. The problem is that good taste has become standardized and is now as inevitable as sea grass. Everybody is doing it with a matter-of-fact, pragmatic efficiency as if conforming to some official directive.

I give you the following: silkcashmere blankets, painted floorboards, elk skins, ticking and deep-seated white sofas. I could go on, but why bother when any of us could recite the elements in our sleep? There is also a formula for clothing: lean jeans, cashmere sweaters, white cotton shirt, big ring, hair in a tangly ponytail.

The truly tasteful can afford to break the mold, but even the maverick touches – disco ball in the TV room, macaroni cheese at the dinner party – are part of a carefully calculated bigger picture: the unexpected twist being the signature of highly evolved good taste.

It's not just that everywhere you go people are following some version of "The Rules Of 21st Century Good Taste", which means our environment has a supermarket-branded predictability about it. And we've painted our yes, white... and I've had a haircut, yes... longish and blondish... It's not even that good taste used to be aspirational and now feels like a requirement of responsible citizens, such as recycling.

The real downer is the terrible tyranny

of good taste – the fact that at the flower stall you are drawn to the faded peonies and not the gaudy chrysanthemums; that when you go to buy a new dress or the paint for the hall you are thinking cool aesthetics rather than originality or – God forbid –

You toy with the idea of going crazy with lilac, but white with a hint of white wins through because safe taste always triumphs over individuality. You think that the turquoise dress is divine, but you know it isn't the obvious dress to buy if you have



a great eye for taste, so you don't.

W h o knew we could all be brought to heel so easily? Who would have guessed how anxious to get it right - or at least to be seen to have got it right – we would become in the process? Remember shopping, as in

the frivolous hit-and-miss habit? Remember the car-crash outfits chosen in a breathless red mist because we had fallen in love with the clashing prints, or the Moroccan handbag bought on holiday – and not even during that ethnic moment?

Remember ugly stuff? Remember the houses of your parents' friends that were sometimes like the sets of Agatha Christie murder mysteries, but mostly a riot of synthetic bean bags, tartan blankets and artifacts turned into lamp shades?

Now you live with a mus-

tard-yellow bedroom on sufferance and make a point of telling any visitors that you are in the process of decorating... "Oh, this? Not us at all..." Is that living well or just another form of self torture, like staying the size you were at university well into your fifties or trying to cook like a TV chef even though you don't get home until eight?

And here's the worst of it – the really tasteful have realized the only way of demonstrating their gifts is by stepping outside the zone and doing "Off Taste".

Off Taste is very, very complicated. It's about introducing out-of-kilter touches that somehow don't jar with the whole; it's about letting things clash, but in a good way.

You don't just need a good eye, you need an almost extrasensory perception of what works with what. You've got a snowball's chance in hell of narrowing it down to a formula. I'm telling you, the nightmare is only just beginning...

BMW makes big claims about new X6

MW claims its new X6 is the "world's first sports-activity coupe" (SAC). While it is certainly the first in this so-called upmarket segment, what about the Toyota RAV 4, which could arguably be labeled the first SAC? Perhaps a moot point, but whereas the Japanese model is firmly established – particularly among the highly impressionable youth market – the X6 is trying to position itself as a top-line, fourwheel-drive model with the latest technology.

With a variety of awardwinning engines, both gasoline

have a lot to offer.

For the first time in BMW's history, the entire model range is turbocharged with a quartet of forced-induction powerplants. Its flagship is a twin-turbo V8 producing a massive 408bhp (300kW) at 5,500rpm.

This 4.4-liter model makes the X6 the most powerful production model in the X-series range. In addition, it chucks out 600Nm of teeth-pull-

and diesel, the X6 does, however, ing torque, from 1,800rpm through to 4,500rpm, and offers up a sprint time of 5.4 seconds from 0 to 100kmh. Top speed, as always with European volume cars, is

electronically limited to 250kmh.

To optimize packaging, allowing a relatively low hood line, the twin turbos and the catalytic converter are located within the vee of the engine. In addition, the location of the turbochargers allows improved performance from the turbos without compromising the front-suspension layout.

Second up is the 3.5L gasoline motor – "International Engine of the Year 2007" winner. The diesel variants are expected to be the biggest sellers in the X6

range. The X6 30d has a single turbocharger, six-cylinder diesel engine delivering a healthy 235bhp at 4,000rpm and 520Nm of torque.

Other important features incorporated in the X6 include a brake-en-

ergy-regeneration system comprising an intelligent alternator control, which improves fuel economy. This is achieved as the alternator reduces drag on the engine by only engaging when required to charge the battery. Additionally, the energy generated by the engine on over-run – under-braking or going downhill that was previously wasted now charges the battery.

Other green measures include low-rolling resistance tires and a high-precision injection system to optimize combustion within the motor.

The X6 is the third X-series model in the range and is built in the States, as is the X5, which is produced at Spartanburg, South Carolina, while the X3 is assembled by the Magna Corporation of Canada in Austria. It is significant that German manufacturers, notably BMW, Mercedes-Benz and, to a limited extent, Porsche, look overseas for production. The strength of the euro is one of their principal concerns, but the US is their major market – particularly for compact SUVs

 and logistics and economics definitely come into

The X6 range is well fitted with a host of standard equipment, such as climate control and electric seats, while the top-of-the-range model has self-lev

eling rear suspension and Nevada-leather upholstery.

The famous BMW iDrive, allowing driver and front-seatpassenger control of climate, audio, navigation and communications, is fitted to all models, but for the average driver is still too complicated to operate.

Novelist of the new Japan

orn four years after the end of World War II, Japanese novelist Haruki Murakami is a world away from traditional masters such as Yasunari Kawabata and Yukio Mishima.

His passions are jazz and Scotch whiskey, not samurais and saki – and instead of historic nostalgia, Murakami ladles out a potent dose of urban hyper-realism and wild surrealism.

Twelve of his novels have been translated into English, the latest being After Dark (Harvill Secker, London, 2007, 201pp.) I've read half of them and been delighted by all.

After Dark takes place on a single night in Tokyo, from just before midnight till just after dawn. Adding to the intensity is Murakami's narrative adoption of a roving camera eye. This cinematic device provides both grand sweep and personal intimacy. The novel opens:

"Eyes mark the shape of the city. "Through the eyes of a high-flying night bird, we take in the scene from midair. In our broad sweep, the city looks like a single gigantic creature – or more like a single collective entity created by many intertwining organisms.

Countless arteries stretch to the end of its elusive body, circulating a continuous supply of fresh blood cells, sending out new data and collecting the old... To the rhythm of its pulsing, all parts of the body flicker and flare up and squirm.

Midnight is approaching, and while the peak of activity has passed, the basal



metabolism that maintains life continues undiminished, producing the basso continuo of the city's moan, a monotonous sound that neither rises nor balls but is pregnant with foreboding.'

The camera then zooms in at a brightly lit, nearly deserted Denny's Restaurant in an entertainment district of bars and love hotels, just before midnight. (Time is indicated by a clock at the top of each chapter.)

A 19-year-old college student named Mari Asai is nursing a coffee and reading a thick tome when she is interrupted by another student eager to talk.

Tetsuya Takahashi had met Mari two years earlier at a swimming pool with her beautiful older sister Eri. A trombonist in a jazz band, he is on his way to a rehearsal in a nearby basement.

A long conversation ensues, with Mari mostly a reluctant participant. Takahashi takes his trombone to rehearsal, but not long after, a giant of a woman with cropped blond hair arrives to ask Mari's help. Her name is Kaoru, a former professional wrestler and now manager of a love hotel called Alphaville.

Her problem is a naked, bleeding Chinese prostitute who has been stripped and

beaten by a client. She'd called her friend Takahashi, who had told her about Mari who speaks fluent Chinese.

Together, the two women clean up and clothe the Chinese prostitute. The camera then follows her assailant, a midnight-shift computer work-er named Shirakawa.

A parallel plot is the mysteriously sleeping Eri. The camera rests on her, then focuses on a television screen where a man with a shrouded face keeps vigil over her body.

Later, awakes trapped in a

room inside the TV screen and searches vainly for escape. Later still, she's restored to her bed. What's going on here?

Surrealism, remember. All of Murakami's novels toy with out-of-body mys-

The beautiful Eri announced to her parents at dinner that she was going to sleep and has been in a deep sleep for nearly two months.

Mari confides this to Takahashi as

they meet in a park in the dead of night. Mari has always been jealous of her sister's beauty and reluctantly confesses to Takahashi that the one time she felt close to her sister was when they were both trapped in a dark elevator.

Throughout this slender novel, the whole movement is by Takahashi toward Mari who slowly opens up and provides a slender ray of hope at the end of the story when she crawls into bed with her sister as a new day dawns:

"Eventually, Eri's small mouth does move slightly, as

if in response to something...

"Whatever it is, something is trying to send a sign to this side through a tiny opening in the consciousness. Such an impression comes to us with certainty."



No need to be tongue-Thai'd anymore

t's easy to start learning a language. You might pick up a few words from friends, memorize a line or two from a phrasebook, even study some grammar.

At the same time, it's easy to get in over your head. And when it comes to mastering a new language, who isn't in over their head?

Think of all the English literary references in, say, a Shrek movie. Now compound that with pop-culture references, slang and characters who speak with halfa-dozen accents – and this is marketed as entertainment for

If you consider how a foreigner learning English must feel, it's dizzying. Yet somehow there are billions who speak or study English as a second language.

So what makes you think you can't learn Thai?

That's where I can help. You're reading the maiden voyage of "Thai 101," a new column in which I'll address questions and issues for students of the Thai language.

I've lived in Thailand off and on for six years.

During these years, learning, improving and mastering my Thai has always been one of my main pursuits.

While you were enjoying the latest bestseller beneath the sun-



shine of Koh Samui, I was browsing the stacks at the library.

While you were honing your karaoke skills, you would have found me reading up on etymology or serial verb construc-

I'm not a polyglot who wants to learn every language. I've studied a few, but Thai has captivated me in a way I can't shake.

Last year, as I approached the five-year anniversary of the first time I ever uttered sawatdee *khrap*, I tried something new – I started a blog, with which this column shares its name.

I called it Thai 101, because even after several years of intensive study, I'm a perpetual student and it reminds me of how much Thai I have still to learn.

The good news is that Thais appreciate even the tiniest amount of effort on your part.

As you may have noticed, most people you meet will be impressed that you are making the effort to learn their difficult language at all.

Some will heap praise upon you as if you had just recited the entire Ramakien, when all you did was order lunch.

I have learned the most by simply speaking Thai with Thais every day. I ask questions, and I pay careful attention to the way natives speak – word choice, phrasing, intonation.

I recommend the same to anyone, but sometimes it's helpful to hear something particularly puzzling explained by someone who has been through the same learning process. That's where I come in.

This column will serve as a useful forum for your questions. Pronunciation, vocabulary, grammar, I'll tackle them all.

The column will be geared toward beginners, but I'll gladly take questions on any topic, any

If it's not suitable for here, I could always write about it on my blog, which tends toward more advanced topics.

Whenever I meet someone who's lived in Thailand for a while and who thinks it's hopeless to learn the language, I want to prove them wrong.

If that's you, then read this column and see if the language isn't worth another try.

Next time we'll kick things off with an overview of free resources for the would-be student of Thai.

We're already in over our heads. We might as well keep swimming.

Stamping out Thailand's unwanted visitors

The capture of alleged international arms dealer Viktor Bout in Bangkok last month is only the latest in a series of high-profile arrests of foreign criminal suspects, fugitives and even international terrorist suspects hiding out on Thai soil or using the country as a base of operations.

The trend has been trumpeted by the Royal Thai Police as evidence of better co-ordination of investigations with its foreign counterparts, but the reality is that Thailand has become an attractive destination for international fugitives.

Many of the reasons for this are obvious and differ little from those of other foreign visitors: the food is delicious, the climate good and the living cheap.

These same factors that have led to Thailand's development as a mass-tourism destination (see "First Person", facing page) also make Thailand a haven for some dangerous characters.

Apart from the ease of entry under the current visa exemptions that apply to nationals of more than 40 countries, once in Thailand, criminals enjoy many infrastructure advantages they would not elsewhere.

For example, Thailand has thousands of Internet cafés across the country, where those of ill-intent can keep in contact with coconspirators and track investigations against themselves with little risk of detection.

The string of headline arrests started with the 2003 capture in Ayudhaya by Thai police and CIA operatives of Indonesian national Riduan "Hambali" Isamuddin.

A number of foreign sex offenders have been extradited to stand trial for child molestation, with the suspects in at least two cases found to have lived in Phuket.

Thailand is also an attractive destination to hide out for more run-of-the-mill criminals, such as 21-year-old American bank-robber Morgan Hoke, aka "the Ponytail Bandit", who entered the Land of Smiles early this year on her own passport after allegedly committing a string of bank robberies with her husband in Texas.

Hoke was apparently so confident in her safety here that she had her mother fly in from Texas to join her – along with her pet cat.

Phuket also suffers from an influx of Thai criminals and fugitives on the run [See news pages]. Hopefully, the planned move of Police Region 8 headquarters to Phuket will signal the start of a serious new approach to crime enforcement on the island – we are going to need it.

Resort manager weighs up impact of mass tourism

he increase in mass tourism has positive and negative effects on Phuket. Mass tourism brings in more guests and helps promote the island, yet package tourists spend less during visits and package-deal vacations are sometimes priced below the combined value of the accommodiations, transportation and meals provided.

I think the demand for tourism services is increasing. The name Phuket has become very well known; I think it is a place everyone wants to see once in their life.

Phuket currently has 380,000 registered accommodation rooms at all levels, from "no star" rooms to full 5-star accommodations.

These support every grade of tourist, but package tourists arriving on charter flights always stay at the 2- to 4-star hotel category. Very few of them stay at five-star hotels.

Some 2,000 new rooms are expected to be added next year. I think it would be great if the number of rooms built correlated to actual market demand - and not just the profit projections of

To protect Phuket against oversupply, new construction should reflect supply and demand factors as forecast by such tourism industry experts as the World Tourism Council (WTC) or the Pacific Asia Travel Association (PATA).

I think it's true that Phuket is becoming a year-round tourist destination. A few years ago, we began calling the low season the "green season" instead.

The green season is aimed at specific groups that travel during this time of year, such as Indians, Chinese, Australians and



huket continues to attract an increasing number of tourists each year, spawning constant growth and private construction while the island's infrastructure development struggles to keep pace. A mass tourism trend has developed and more and more tourists arrive here on package tours, which are especially popular among Asian visi-

Methee Tanmanatragul, former President of the Thai Hotels Association Southern Chap-

ter and currently the managing director of Phuket Rising Sun Residence in Chalong, is wary of mass tourism.

Here he shares his thoughts on mass tourism, infrastructure woes and related topics. Compiled by *Gazette* Chief Reporter **Sangkhae Leelanapaporn**.



If we could better manage supply and demand, it would become less necessary to compete among ourselves using promotional price discounts. Then, if we became faced with a major crisis, there would be less need to worry. We could still fall back on using big discounts to survive as

Currently there is a problem with the rate of overall growth compared to infrastructure development. Infrastructure maintenance and new construction is funded by the government, but the demand for it is created by rapid growth in tourism and new projects built by the private sector. Government infrastructure simply can't keep up.

Consider as an example Phuket International Airport. There is insufficient parking and security-check lines for departures are very long. I don't think tourists want or expect this. They shouldn't have to wait for more than an hour to clear Customs and Immigration. The situation is problematic for both arrivals and departures, but with more tourists coming every year the government infrastructure is having trouble catching up.

As previously stated, the best solution would be to control mass tourism by evaluating supply and demand according to WTC and PATA forecasts. Investors would have to comply, with the government responsible

for enforcing new regulations on permissable development.

The government should consider putting in place regulations to limit growth on new construction and improve tourism-industry management. It would not be difficult, but would require determination and commitment from all sides. Sitting down to discuss the issue would be the necessary first

In Singapore and Hong Kong, they forecast how many three- or five-star hotels should be built over a five-year period. Then they adapt these plans according to what the market does over that time.

This is very different from Thailand, where investors can do whatever they want – if they have

money and land.

We should do business with long-term sustainability in mind, not just short-term profits over three to five years. Currently, when a major crisis occurs evervone suffers and we must wait at least two or three years to recover because supply keeps going up while demand remains relatively constant.

Everyone wants the number of tourists to go up and up, but they forget to consider that more arrivals does not always equate to more profit; less can be more – if you manage it correctly. More tourists and unregulated growth can not only mean reduced profits, but also lead to unecessary environmental destruction and stiff competition.

We have to plan for future crises, accepting that anything can happen without warning -including disasters both natural and man-made. Nowhere in the world is completely safe.

I'm not concerned with regualting how individual hotels market their products and ser-

I'm worried about the overall management of Phuket's tourism industry, especially its affect on infrastructure requirements.

For example, better regulation and organization could fix Phuket's transport woes. There is no need for an expensive light rail system. Other countries that receive more tourists than Phuket do not have light rail transport, but they manage their bus and other transport systems well.

Currently when a guest walks out of the Phuket airport, it is as if he or she is a piece of meat that everyone is fighting over to grab and eat. That's how it is now, but if we had better tourism management the situation would certainly improve.

Re-entry permits: the art of staying in Thailand

I obtained my first non-immigrant due to expire on February 8. I living and working in Thailand.

My non-imm B visa was due to expire, so I went to Kuala Lumpur to obtain a new non-imm

My accountant prepared all the paperwork for my application. Upon presenting these papers in KL, I was told by embassy staff that I could be issued only a single-entry, three-month B visa. When I questioned this, all I was told was that the problem was my work permit, but they couldn't say exactly what.

I was in Kuala Lumpur on January 30 and my work permit, which is valid for one year, was

B, multiple-entry visa in the UK explained that I would renew my last year and have since then been work permit when I returned to Thailand. However, they insisted I could be issued only a singleentry visa, but that I could upgrade this to a multiple-entry visa in Thailand.

However, my accountant told me that this cannot be done in Thailand and that I will have to return to Kuala Lumpur and again apply for a non-imm B visa before my current visa runs out.

Can you please advise me of the best action as my business requires me to leave Thailand often and having a single-entry visa makes this difficult.

Pol Capt Krissarat Nuesen, of the Phuket Provincial Immigration Office, replies:

You can apply for a oneyear permit-to-stay based on the non-immigrant B visa that you received from the Thai embassy in Kuala Lumpur.

You must apply for a oneyear permit-to-stay at the Phuket Immigration Office before your visa expires. You qualify for the permit-to-stay under category 7.1 of the Order of The Royal Thai Office Headquarters, No. 606/ 2549.

Once you have been issued

with a one-year permit-to-stay, apply for a re-entry permit before you need to leave Thailand again. Otherwise, if you leave Thailand, you will need to obtain a new visa.

The re-entry permit will allow to you to return to Thailand without voiding your one-year permit-to-stay.

A single-use re-entry permit costs a1,000 baht and a multiple re-entry permit costs 3,800 baht.

With a one-year permit-tostay and a multiple re-entry permit, you no longer need to obtain a new visa from an embassy or consulate.

made a New Year's resolution to keep a database and track all announcements by government agencies concerning ICT and software development. I am regretting that commitment already. March saw more than 40 announcements from Thai government agencies on high-technology projects planned for the next five years.

I'll try to make some sense of it all. Let's start with the master plans. The Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Ministry is developing its National ICT Master Plan 2007-2011 to submit for Cabinet approval in September. Its purpose is to reduce the digital divide between people in metropolitan and rural areas, allowing everyone in Thailand access the Net.

Meanwhile, the Association of Thai Software Industry

(ATSI) is working with the National Science and Technology Development Agency's Technology Management Center (TMC) through the Industry

Technology Assistance Program (iTAP).

The program aims to develop Roadmap 2020 – a plan by the TMC to set the direction of Thailand's software development over the next 12 years.

In addition, the National Electronics and Computer Technology Center (Nectec) is developing a knowledge-engineeringtechnology roadmap. The fiveyear plan has three phases: 1) collect information that can be accessed through a specially developed content-management system; 2) create a digital library that automatically summarizes information; 3) develop a knowledge-based system prototype with artificial intelligence, allowing people to search for any kind of knowledge through text, voice and images.

Education Minister Somchai Wongsawat recently made three startling announcements: 1) the Education Ministry will buy one million notebook computers to be loaned to students; 2) he will ask the ICT Ministry to provide highspeed Internet access to all 32,434 public schools in Thailand; 3) the Education Ministry will spend about 12.4 billion baht over the next four years to "develop IT personnel for providing IT knowledge to students", which hopefully means lots and lots of qualified IT teachers.

Nectec has designated Digitized Thailand as its flagship

project for the year. It will provide a network and the tools to use it and it will act as a central collection point of digital content contributed to and accessible anytime, anywhere, by anybody.

The Application of Digital Library for Education project is another part of the Digitized Thailand plan. This one is by the Office of the Basic Education Commission, under the Ministry of Education. Students and teachers will have access to a digi-

tal library of books, articles, music, videos, photographs and other learning resources.

There are also many projects and programs on the

drawing boards to help Thai software companies. The National Innovation Agency, under the Science Ministry, will provide funding support to private companies to encourage innovation and the patenting of intellectual property.

The Software Industry Promotion Agency (SIPA) believes that open-source software is a crucial area of innovation, and encourages local users to support and promote open source.

Nectec and the Open Source Software Network will next year establish the Linux Technology Center as a base for local open-source-software development. The three-year goal is to produce a 100% Thai-made open-source mobile device for data collection and storage.

SIPA will work with the Office of Small and Medium En-

terprise Promotion to establish a Digital Content Incubation Center aimed at supporting IT start-ups and SMEs providing consultancy, training, technical support and electronic media. The center will aim to have such companies promote collaboration among local software developers.

ATSI plans to set up a software fund to provide soft loans of three years to businesses so they can invest in Thai software.

ATSI is also working with the Department of Industrial Promotion, SIPA, Microsoft, Rangsit University and 20 other local software producers to set up the country's first software factory.

Promoting Thai software in other countries is a big priority. With the help of ATSI, Nectec

aims to promote Thai software in emerging markets. To this end, Nectec has already signed a memorandum of understanding to promote Thai software in Bhutan. ATSI has asked SIPA for 5 million baht to make a Thai-made software suite for Laos.

The Thai Software Export Promotion Association plans to boost software exports by helping local companies tap into the international market. Plans include targeting the financial market in Vietnam, followed by China, Japan and the Philippines.

On the heels of the "Go To US Market" scheme, Software Park Thailand has developed the "Go To Chinese Market" program, to encourage local software businesses to penetrate the Chi-

nese market. The Park signed a memorandum of understanding with Singapore-Hangzhou Science and Technology Park, which will act as a matchmaker to identify and link potential partners with Thai software businesses.

The most sensible of all these plans is an initiative of SIPA's electronic-commerce sub-committee to match the demands of E-commerce and software in the tourism industry with local software providers.

The first three priority E-commerce applications for the initial stage are electronic marketing, online reservations and interactive digital mapping.

There are more than 1,000 potential target clients in the tourism industry that need software and systems to improve productivity. Future applications could include customer-relationship management and electronic-payment systems.

The big question is, "Where are all these software developers and IT professionals coming from and who is going to train them?" A program initiated by ATSI will train senior students in software programming and development processes to make them "industry ready" when they graduate. Students from the nine universities of the Rajamangala University of Technology system will be sent for training and work at local software companies in the ATSI network.

Sripatum University in Bangkok plans to invest 300 million baht to upgrade its ICT infrastructure to become an "ICT Campus", offering ICT and software-related courses. The university will also open its "Information Service Institute" to provide IT courses.

SIPA can evidently pull many rabbits out of a hat. They are hoping to produce 10,000 IT and computer professionals "as Thailand has a lack of IT skills, especially computer engineers". How they are going to achieve this has yet to be revealed.

PHUKET CITY: Central Retail Corporation (CRC) has announced that the Phuket HomeWorks supercenter, currently under construction across the bypass road from Central Festival, is the corporation's largest HomeWorks project to date.

The home fittings and furnishings supercenter is being constructed at a cost of one billion baht and is expected to open before the end of October. It is currently 20% complete.

Up to 300,000 customers per month are expected to shop at the center, consisting of a HomeWorks superstore, a Power Buy store and an electronics and computers center.

HomeWorks will take up 10,000sqm of the new building while Power Buy will occupy about 3,000sqm. The remaining area will be rented out said Kamchai Louiyapong, Vice-President – Business Development of CRC Power Retail Co

He added that the two-story building will cover a total area of 26,000sqm.

An enclosed walkway over the bypass road linking Central Festival and HomeWorks will allow customers to shop at both stores. The cross-flow of shoppers is expected to be a major draw card for commercial tenants in the new center Khun Kamchai said.

"With investment capital of 1 billion baht, we expect to recoup our outlay in eight to 10 years," he added.

Nilubol Jirapattanapongm, Marketing Director of CRC Power Retail Co, said that HomeWorks and Power Buy will be the main attractions for customers.

"HomeWorks in Phuket is our big-

gest project to date. With investment capital of a billion baht, this kind of investment is more than that of some hotels. We are willing to invest this much because we are confident that Central and HomeWorks work together very well," she said.

K. Nilubol added that the Home-Works store in the supercenter will be unique in that 30% of its product range will not be available at other Home-Works outlets. "As people in Phuket have high-spending power, we will be offering high-end products in a range of areas, from built-in furniture to wooden floors and even outdoor spas," she said.

The Homeworks and Power Buy in the Homeworks supercenter will also offer greater ranges of goods than their counterparts in Central Festival, which will remain open, said K. Kamchai.

"Central Festival focuses on fashion and entertainment, but HomeWorks is for home and home services," said K. Kamchai. "We will co-ordinate our marketing plans and join activities with Central, so customers will flow between the two. People who rent shop space can be assured they will have customers as our strength is marketing."

K. Nilubol explained, "We often share media coverage with Central Festival with things such as advertising and promoting events, but much of our marketing

we do ourselves because we have a different customer target group."

"Our target clients are owners of new and old homes. People who are renovating or redecorating their homes think of us first," she added.

Asked why HomeWorks opened the small outlet in the basement of Central Festival, K. Kamchai explained that that small-shop format is well suited to Bangkok where HomeWorks has outlets

in smaller shopping malls. "With bigger, stand-alone HomeWorks centers, we can offer more products and a greater variety so customers can get exactly what they want," he said.

"Besides, Phuket has the fastestgrowing property market in Thailand. So if we want to be responsive to customers' needs, we must have a bigger format, new items and a complete range of products. We have some imported products as well," he added.

Smaller stores inside the complex will be allocated into the following zones: Zone 1 restaurants; Zone 2 banking, retail and services shops; Zone 3 decor stores; Zone 4 furniture; Zone 5 food; Zone 6 small shops of about 80sqm each.

The entrances will be lined with small retail shops and a central area will be used for staging events.

In attracting commercial tenants, K. Kamchai said, "The front of the building will have an area of 400sqm with high visibility. We are confident that people who rent shop spaces in this area will attract many customers from their shops being very prominent."

Another attraction, K. Kamchai said, is parking. "Often there is not enough parking space at Central, so shoppers will be able to park here and walk to Central using the bridge," he explained.

Weak dollar has ripple effect

he falling US dollar might appear to be bad news only for America, but the weak dollar is causing strains in many economies.

Japan is watching the yen, appreciate rapidly against the dollar. There is no sense of national pride in having a strong yen. Quite the reverse, it is making Japanese exports to the greater US dollar zone more expensive and less competitive.

The Japanese economy appears to be managing to stay out makes the euro an expensive proof a recession, although economic growth is so weak

the economy is almost stagnating.

One year ago, the Bank of Japan, Japan's central bank, was poised to increase interest rates from the dismal base rate of 0.5%. However, as the credit crunch, felt mainly in the US and later in Europe, started to take hold, conditions for any

interest rate hike started to dis-

The Bank of Japan is more likely to cut interest rates, but when you have rates at 0.5% it is only a little way to go before reaching zero. The Bank of Japan is aware that it has limited room to maneuver. Japan may have the world's second highest foreign reserves at around US\$ 1 trillion, but it also has the world's highest domestic debt at 180% of gross domestic product.

This debt is different to the debt in countries such as America. In the US, the debt was mainly incurred by consumers, although the government played a substantial role. Japan's debt was caused almost completely by crazy government spending in the 1990s when the ruling party thought that the way to raise Japan from recession was to throw money at the problem.

Quite how anyone expects Japan to be able to repay its domestic debt remains unanswered.

This is an area that has many economists and investors worried. If Japan was able to fall into a financial quagmire after the booms of the 1970s and 1980s, it is possible that the US could fall into the same trap. They both share one common problem: too much debt.

The euro zone appears to be the beneficiary of the falling US dollar. The value of the euro is rising rapidly, which is good for euro-zone residents vacationing in America or importing goods from a weaker currency area.

However, for exports, it duction center and manufactur-

ers are, where possible, moving operations to cheaper countries. more rapidly the euro appreciates, the greater the pressure for manufacturers to relo-

Usually during the economic cycle, the US leads the way, followed by the UK and then Europe. Impacts

that are felt in America today are felt some months later in other parts of the world. (The "real" world as opposed to the "financial" world, which usually anticipates events.) This can be felt both when economies are slowing and recovering.

Currencies, such as the pound sterling and the euro, can



against the dollar. However, currencies are no different from other areas of financial markets. They resemble pendulums and when they move in any direction they generally move too far before correction sets in.

There is increasing concern that a significant percentage of the world is going to experience a protracted recession; something so bad that economic historians will have to go back decades to find parallels.

This is only one school of thought; many economists believe that there is a recent trend of milder and shorter historical

The greatest asset that we have today, compared with even a decade ago, is the rise in the size of some emerging economies. These include China, India, Russia and Brazil, but it is easy to overlook parts of the Middle East and newcomers such as such as Malaysia and many countries in Eastern Europe have grown dramatically. The center of economic gravity and foreign exchange reserves have moved

rapidly to the East. US economic problems and their potential to spread to Western Europe will cause pain further afield. Groupings such as Asean have a lot of interregional trade, which helps insulate them from problems outside the region. Even a decade ago interregional trade was somewhat embryonic.


Several decades ago, the world economy was almost totally reliant on North America and Western Europe. Then Japan entered the equation. With so many substantial economies reaching a "critical mass", the dynamics of the situation have changed.

In 1998, the Russian economy was on the verge of collapse and its size was of little consequence; 10 years later, Russia, if expressed as a European economy, is now Europe's largest automobile market. It also has large foreign exchange reserves and even boasts its own sovereign wealth fund.

It shows just how much can change in a decade.

t was early evening and getting dark as a car sped along the highway towards Bangkok. A cellphone rang repeatedly and Yellow Tiger barked out the same phrase to callers: "Somsak lost by third-round knockout, Somsak lost by third-round knockout!"

It was October 4, 2006 and Somsak Sithchatchawal had just been knocked out by Panamanian Celestino Caballero in a bout that came to shock Thai fans – and it was Yellow Tiger's job to break the bad news to them.

Yellow Tiger embarked on his career as a boxing writer some 30 years ago, 10 years before the championship reign of the great Khaosai Galaxy. Now one of Thailand's most well-known boxing journalists, known to his readers as Yellow Tiger and for one distinguishing feature: a lazy left eye that he's had since birth.

In 1975, Yellow Tiger married a go-go dancer in Phuket. He was struggling to make ends meet working as a fisherman. Madly in love, he worked hard to build a life with his new wife; she had other ideas, however.

After a year of marriage and poverty, it became too much for her to bear. One day while Yellow Tiger was out at sea, she packed her bags and left, never to be seen again. He was devastated.

Yellow Tiger quickly decided he was in need of a drastic life change. He hopped on a fishing truck and headed for Bangkok in search of a new life. He had just 85 baht to his name.

Phuket's Yellow Tiger still roars

"It was rough at first," he said. "I was in bad shape. No-body would give me a job. Even the soi dogs were scared of me."

Within a few days, he landed a job as a janitor at Nonthaburi Boxing Stadium. It was there he nurtured his love for Muay Thai and boxing into a career. He worked at the stadium for a few years, learning the ins and outs of the sport and making valuable connections. The stadium eventually closed, but he used his contacts to find a job as an office boy on the now defunct *Boxing and Muay Thai Magazine*.

His love for boxing and Muay Thai inspired him to study the different styles of the writers at the magazine and to give writing a shot. It wasn't easy; he had a third-grade education and was untrained in journalism. Before long, though, he had his first article published and he was writing full time for the magazine.

It was while working at *Boxing and Muay Thai Magazine* that he was given the name Yellow Tiger. Malaysians are sometimes referred to as Tiger People because of the abundance of tigers in the region. Phuket, where Yellow Tiger hails from, is next to the Malaysian border – or so thought people in the Bangkokbased Muay Thai community.

Since he was the only southerner working on the magazine, his editor, Prateep Buaram,

came up with the nickname Yellow Tiger to give readers a moniker they could remember. Decades later, it's the name he is known by.

Yellow Tiger writes for *Muay Lok Magazine*, where he has his own fan club, Chik Song (the Open Envelope).

Despite being unable to speak a word of English, he has traveled the globe covering fights and has met some of the biggest names in boxing.

Not bad for a once povertystricken fisherman from Phuket who was married to – and dumped by – a go-go dancer.

Construction Update

Phase 1 of Saphan Hin makeover 20% complete

PHUKET CITY: Work on the first phase of a project to beautify 6,000 square meters along the Saphan Hin waterfront is now 20% complete.

The project, which is being co-ordinated by Phuket City Municipality, is expected to be complete by September.

Kriangsak Chuchatpong, director of the Public Works Division of Phuket City Municipality, told the *Gazette* that the aim of the "Ley Nai Muang" project is to protect Phuket's coast at Saphan Hin from potential erosion by sea water.

The landscaping of the area is also set to make Saphan Hin more appealing as a place for the public to visit.

The first phase of the project commenced at the beginning of March and comprises a three-meter-high, 268m-long stone embankment. Phase 1 also includes a 2.8m wide, 380m long concrete promenade along the waterfront.

Funded by Phuket City Municipality, the first phase of construction has been allocated a budget of 10 million baht.

Phase 2, which is currently in the planning stage, will shift the focus of the project onto land-scaping.

"We still need another budget for the second phase. We are waiting for next year's budget and expect to finish about midnext year.

"This first phase needs about 180 days to complete and we expect to finish on time, although we are facing some problems, such as not enough workers," said K. Kriangsak.

When completed, Saphan Hin will be a public area that K. Kriangsak hopes will be well received by locals and visitors to Phuket.

"Saphan Hin is a well-known place where people go to see the sunrise in the morning, just like at Promthep Cape where people go to see the sunset in the evening," said K. Kriangsak.

The project was designed by Phuket City Municipality and the construction contractor is Phuket Rock Co Ltd.

The insidious ginger heads

know I sometimes go on a bit and have been known to drone incessantly about the most inane subjects. Believe it or not, I have even been accused of ranting about things that have absolutely no connection with gardening.

Sometimes, rants are absolutely necessary and some subjects so significant, that they justify repetition. I'm not referring to global warming, world health issues or the futility of war.

I'm talking about something far more insidious, concerning those who suffer from an incurable, but seldom-discussed affliction: Gingervitis.

Gingervitis is a condition that some of us are born with; unfortunately little can be done about it. If it was just the unfortunate color of their orangy-reddy hair it wouldn't be so bad, but combined with their worryingly pale skin and those inevitable freckles, it's just not right.

God help the ginger kids. They must have it really bad. Ever since that episode of South Park with the "We've all seen them – on the playground, at the store, walking on the streets – they creep us out" speech, I have had a strange suspicion that their peers must take the mickey mercilessly. I know I would have. Still do actually.

Even my own sister is guilty of blatant, out-and-out gingerism. One of her daughters has a massive mop of red hair. Ginger? She insists not. My niece is about as "auburn" as Chris Evans. To anyone who's never seen that particularly irritating ginger buffoon on British television program TFI Friday, well he's an... irritating ginger buffoon.

Having said that, gingers do seem to be somewhat proud of their carrot-top looks. I was chatting to a friend of mine today, who has full-blown ginger-vitis, over several bloody Marys. He's a lost

cause. There is little anyone can do for him.

He has noticed a bizarre irony. He rightfully points out that while there are many strange people in this world who, for reasons best known to themselves, choose to dye their hair various shades of red, you don't meet too many gingers who choose to disguise their plight.

Gingers do have something in common with the world of flora; a plant named in their honor. Actually, the moniker is where the similarities end, as the ginger plant family has far less dodgy hair and decidedly fewer annoying freckles.

The ginger plant is best known for its long history as a pungent spice for cooking and as an herbal remedy for various ailments; more importantly it forms the basic ingredient for the ultimate tea-dunking biscuit.

Here in Phuket, we're more likely to see the more floral versions – more commonly known by the color of their flowers: red, yellow or white ginger. White Ginger (hedychium coronarium), is a tropical perennial and a not-too-distant cousin of the culinary ginger (zingiber officinale) of tea-dunking biscuit fame.

Otherwise known as the butterfly ginger lily, or *mahahong* in Thai, it is originally native to India. White ginger is an attractive, tough plant that will reach up to a couple of meters in height if grown in containers.

The leaves are 20 to 30 centimeters long, lance-shaped and sharp-pointed. The plant is easy to spot, as these leaves are arranged in two neat, opposite rows that run up either side of the stem.

The white ginger can be one of the most fragrant plants in the garden, bearing flowers that not surprisingly, given its alternate epithet, vaguely resemble butterflies.

The flowers eventually give way to showy seed pods chock full of bright red seeds. The plant is popular in Hawaii and the Pacific Islands were it is used in leis – those garlandy things they hang around each others' necks.

These things don't need much encouragement. With a bit of TLC, they will quickly outgrow any container you might have in the house, so yearly division is needed.

As with other plants that produce one-off flowers at the end of a stem, it's a good idea to deadhead spent flower blooms and remove old stems, allowing nutrients into the developing parts of the plant promoting new growth.

The white ginger plant does best in partial shade and soil with a lot of organic matter. The plants should be kept fairly moist. If potted, the stems can be immersed in water up to the crown.

This is one of those plants that you can successfully propagate with rhizomes.

Dummies' guide to the process: Plant the rhizome in the smallest pot in which it will fit loosely, and cover with ten centimeters of potting soil. Water it. Place the pot in a bright or sunny spot till the rhizome sprouts. Keep the soil on the dry side. That's it.

As with ginger-headed people, these things aren't very good at standing up for themselves.


You should be prepared to stake them, as they start tilting and falling over as the stalks struggle to carry the weight the plant when the heavy flowers are in full bloom. At least they don't have Gingervitis though.

Maybe we should form a society here in Phuket for these afflicted individuals. Then they will have a place where they can get together and swap amusing ginger anecdotes. I've got a name for it: the PGA. The Phuket Gingervitis Association.

I even know of a wooden house where they can meet regularly. Perhaps calling it the PG Woodhouse would be pushing it a tad though. Maybe not – gingers are a strange lot.

ith more than 5.4 million tourist arrivals to Phuket in 2007, the market will have to look to the skies in order to maintain its upward momentum.

So far, the Airports of Thailand (AOT) has failed to grasp the scope of expansion needed for coping with the increased levels of traffic in the region.

Current problem areas are lack of parking, management of vehicular traffic flow at airport entrances and exits, inferior passenger facilities and minimal apron space and passenger docks. It appears that this lack of long-term planning will inevitably choke the goose that laid the golden egg for Phuket's tourism.

While Phuket has done little to improve airport facilities, its domestic competitors are expanding.

On Koh Samui a second airport is in the works. At Koh Kood, an island in Trat province, plans are underway for a new

commercial airport aimed at the same tourist demographic Phuket's.

With international hotel chains such as Six Senses opening up on Koh Kood, the island represents strong competition and is quickly becoming the fourthlargest island des-

tination after Phuket, Koh Samui and Koh Chang.

Meanwhile, back in the Andaman region, there is good news that the provincial government in Phang Nga is looking to build an airport north of Khao Lak



poses infrastructure challenges such as the need for a bridge to the island, which is currently ser-

viced by ferries, it appears to be a step in the right direction.

The Khao Lak hotel market continues to expand, with international chains such as the Meridien and Ramada adding to the current inventory of 4,000 rooms in the area. Although the prop-

erty industry in Khao Lak is still in its infancy, this is predicted to take off as well.

While this governmentsponsored airport initiative is a positive, it is often the case that these substantial infrastructure projects don't quite match the re-

quirements of their users. In Krabi, for example, Tiger Airways ceased flying to the Krabi airport as demand did not meet its short-term goals.

Koh Samui, in contrast, has been an excellent case study as a destination airport success story in a location dominated by tourism. The existing airport, privately owned and operated by Bangkok Airways, has grown over the years with an attractive and exotic design that reflects both Thailand and the local flavor.

Bangkok Airways has a vested, long-term interest in the facility and remains focused on the larger picture of the developing market.

At major airports the landing and take-off fees amount to more than 10% of overhead costs for airlines, making the small, regional airports a more lucrative option for both international and low-cost carriers.

Therefore, a private airport in Phang Nga operated by a lowcost carrier might be the recipe for long-term success. Not only would it allow better tourist ac-

cess to Khao Lak but it would also free up space at the existing Phuket airport, enabling it to better service its own direct market.

At Phuket Airport, meanwhile, the main discussion point remains the lengthening of the runway at a time when smaller regional aircraft growth is far outpacing that of the larger and more fuel-hungry 747s of a bygone era.

In a nutshell, Phuket and its neighbors need either a second airport or a large-scale expansion, neither of which are on books for the current facility. If the pace of infrastructure can't keep up with market demand, then visitors will go to other locations in Thailand or fast-growing locations such as Cambodia or

Vietnam. Looking to the skies, the answer is out there but it appears to be in a holding pattern.
