Gov suspends Destination Air Patong flights

PHUKET: Citing complaints of noise pollution and threats to public safety, Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit on April 3 ordered Destination Air to stop its seaplane shuttle flights to and from Patong Bay until the company complies with all Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) regulations.

The DCA representatives and Gov Niran noted that although Destination Air was issued a permit to operate nonscheduled flights to several destinations along the Andaman Coast until 2011, the permit granted by the DCA was based on an Initial Environmental Evaluation (IEE) to operate in a marine national park in Krabi.

DCA Deputy Director-General Wuthichai Singhamanee admitted that the DCA was unaware of actual conditions in Patong when it granted the per-

Destination Air's permit specifies several conditions of operation, including the use of safety buoys to mark landing and takeoff zones and the obligation to ferry passengers from plane to shore by boat, which must also warn other vessels in the area before landings and takeoffs.

Instead, there was solid evidence that the planes have been flying low over several resorts before landing, then taxiing to a floating dock, K. Wuthichai said.

The DCA may suspend the permit if the carrier is found to

be violating the conditions under which the permit was granted, he said.

Destination Air's listing of a flight schedule on its website and promotional brochures was also a problem because Destination Air's permit was granted strictly for non-scheduled flights, K. Wuthichai added.

Gov Niran said he decided to halt the flights until Destination Air can prove it will comply with all DCA conditions.

The carrier can resume its service to Patong after it submits a new IEE for its operations in the area and convinces the DCA that it will abide by all the terms listed in its flight permit, he said.

The managing director of Destination Air described Governor Niran's order to suspend flight service to Patong as "anticlimactic", saying the airline had for months been scheduled to wrap up operations in Patong because of unsafe monsoon-season conditions now setting in.

Pat James told the *Gazette* that the governor's decision, taken in the wake of complaints about noise pollution and safety concerns, would have little effect on the company or its custom-

Mr James said he suspects the suspension order to have been a way of pleasing those in opposition to the service. [See "First Person", p29, for full story]

Candidates register for Phuket City elections

PHUKET CITY: The first day to register candidacies for the upcoming Phuket City Municipality elections saw a large turnout by supporters of both the incumbent Khon Noom (Young Turks) party-led by incumbent mayor Somjai Suwannasuppana, and her rival Ayuth Tansiriroj and his Chao Baan Sarng San (Creative) party on April 8.

K. Ayuth, a lawyer and former ally of K. Somjai, hopes to wrest control of City Hall from the Young Turks after almost three decades of continuous rule.

One of three deputy mayors dismissed by Mayor Somjai in April of 2005, K. Ayuth is a cousin of one of the original founders of the Young Turks.

Candidacy registration opened at 8:30 am at the Phuket City Municipality meeting room on Narisorn Rd. The process was overseen by Phuket Vice-Governor Tri Augaradacha in his capacity as president of the Phuket Election Committee.

After Phuket City Municipality's four-year term ended on April 4, the new election was set for May 11.

On that day, polling stations will be open in four voting districts across the city, from 8:30 am to 3 pm.

Voters will cast ballots for mayor, along with six choices for a city council seat from their district in the 24-seat assembly.

In a draw of lots, K. Somjai and K. Ayuth drew numbers 1 and 2, respectively.

For regular city councilor seats, Young Turk candidates drew numbers 1 to 6, while Creative candidates drew numbers 7 to 12.









Robbery ring rounded up

PATONG: Kathu Police on April 7 arrested six men for a string of robberies in the popular beach

Kathu Police Inspector Lt Col Chalermchai Hernsawas and a squad of fellow officers made the initial arrest about 5 pm.

The case started when 25year-old Saiyon Jantorn reported seeing a man sitting atop her redand-black JRD motorcycle, which was parked near Laem Petch Temple, he said, adding that K. Saiyon had reported the motorcycle stolen on March 31.

"We moved quickly and arrested Chokchai 'Choke' Janpairoj, 22, from Rayong. During questioning, he admitted that he and his friends had stolen the motorcycle," Lt Col Chalermchai

"We then raided his rented room near Soi Kathu Waterfall, where we arrested his roommate Kanoknan "Nok" Sawangwong, 25, from Phuket.

In their room, police seized a purse that still contained the ID card of its owner, a DVD player, six mobile phones, a Honda Wave motorcycle and receipts from a pawnshop for pawned gold necklaces. "We took both men back to the police station for further questioning. Last night [April 7] we were able to arrest their four friends at the football field," he said.

All confessed to committing several robberies and turning over the stolen goods to Choke, who would sell them and divide the proceeds among them, he added.

Lt Col Chalermchai identified three of the other suspects as: Wassana "Eak" Buathong, 24, from Nakhon Sri Thammarat; Virachai "Lek" Choomjud, 26, also from Nakhon Sri Thammarat; and Boonyarit "Rid" Srisuwan, 29, from Patthalung. The fourth person was identified only as as "Wanchai", from Nakhon Sawan.

The 'Khun Bhumi' patrol boat arrives

PHUKET: The Phuket Marine Police Region 5 office on March 31 received two new patrol boats: Tor 635 and Tor 814, also named the Khun Bhumi.

Tor 814 (pictured, right) is named Khun Bhumi in memory of Khun Bhumi Jensen, the son of HRH Princess Ubol Ratana Rajakanya who died in the tsunami.

Attending the official reception at Rassada Port were Phuket Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima and Marine Police Commander Maj Gen Misakawan Buara.

Both boats were commissioned to patrol the Andaman waters and to replace patrol boat Tor 813, which the tsunami left stranded about a kilometer inland at Khao Lak.

Tor 813 remains where it was grounded as a memorial to the



New registration van makes slow progress

PHUKET CITY: The introduction of a high-tech mobile registration van late last year has recorded an increase of 16,000 in Phuket's official population, only a small fraction of the island's "hidden population" of about

The project is the brainchild of Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit, who announced that tackling the hidden population problem would be a top priority after he was promoted to Governor in October 2006.

The main goal of the Internet-able van, fitted with equipment costing 4.6 million baht, is to register as many as possible of the estimated 300,000 Thais who now call Phuket home, but who are registered as residents of other provinces.

With only about half of the Thais living in Phuket registered as living here, Phuket loses out on population-based budget allotments from the central government, including those for critical areas such as education and law

Of the people who have used the mobile registration service since it was launched in January last year, 35,117 used it to transfer out of the province compared with 49,212 who used it to register as now officially residing in Phuket.

Phuket Provincial Chief Administrative Officer (*Palad*) Piya Bharatasilpin admitted that the project has not been the success the provincial government had hoped for.

'The service was set up to

increase the registered population, but we must allow people to use it to transfer out of the province as well," he said.

Among those transfered out of Phuket are recently graduated students and people who find work in other provinces, he said.

Current funding allows service stops about three times a month until September 25. The service is provided in areas requested by Phuket's three District Offices, K. Piya said.

Frenchman crushed under cement truck

PHUKET CITY: French national Dominique Jules Valery Bagus, 46, died instantly when he was crushed under the wheels of a cement mixer truck on March 30.

Capt Supachai Petchsakul of Phuket City Police told the Gazette that Mr Bagus was driving a Suzuki motorcycle on Thepkrasattri Rd when the accident happened.


"He was overtaking a cement truck being driven by 31year-old Yutthana Promwiset. who was on his way back after a delivery in Soi Luck Kong Sri.

"As the truck turned left, Mr Bagus tried pass it in the left lane, leaving the truck driver no time to brake," he said.

A Kusoldharm rescue worker told the Gazette that Mr Bagus was killed instantly when his skull was crushed under the wheels of the truck.

According to the French Embassy in Bangkok, Mr Bagus' family, who are from Avesnes-le-Comte in France, arrived in Phuket on April 4 to claim his body at Vachira Phuket Hospital.

Patong beach road to become 'clearway'

PATONG: Patong Deputy Mayor Chairat Sukkabal on April 2 announced that from next high season no parking will be allowed along the busy beach road.

"Taxis will be allowed on Thaweewong Rd only to drop off passengers," K. Chairat told a press conference at Phuket Provincial Hall.

"Tuk-tuks and hawkers are currently taking up all the parking spaces along the beach road, leaving tourists with no place to park. We will provide more car park spaces and change traffic regulations to force all cars to park on the new road, away from the beach," he said.

The new road he was referring to was Phang Muang Rd, which is being built parallel between Nanai Rd and Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd, which is expected to be completed before the next high season.

The new road will redirect traffic, including tuk-tuks, away from Thaweewong Rd, thus making Patong more tourist-friendly, he said.

K. Chairat said that the area has long been struggling with a high number of tuk-tuks because drivers from Kata, Kamala and Karon flock to Patong due to the higher income potential.



From next high season, the busy Patong beach road (Thaweewong Rd) will be free of parked vehicles, leaving traffic to flow along the popular beachfront, says Patong Deputy Mayor Chairat Sukkabal.

He added that Patong Municipality had received a growing number of complaints from tourists who felt that the town was overcrowded with tuk-tuks and

"They are annoyed by the traffic jams on Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd and Thaweewong Rd," he said.

Traffic accidents near the beach and on Patong Hill, especially during rush hour, were also on the tourist's list of concerns, he added.

While focusing on cleaning up the town, K. Chairat said that Patong Municipality woud be keeping an eye on the number of sun beds being rented out on the beach.

"After the tsunami, we allowed sun bed operators to set up an extra row of sun beds, but they have kept adding to them and now we see up to three rows in the high season, totaling about 2,000 sun beds.

"We want to ensure that number is sustainable and does not grow any further," he said.

"Also, food vendors and hawkers are required to number their vehicles and stalls so that tourists can report them when a problem arises," he said.

PHUKET: Well-known restaurateur and local resident "Bepy" Graziano di Ceneda passed away about 9:30 April 7 after succumbing to lung cancer.

A native of Florence, Italy, Bepy had lived in Phuket for 15 years and was well known here, especially in Cherng Talay, where his popular Toto restaurant stands at Tinlay Place on the road into the Laguna resort complex.

Bepy was also well known for starting the Mulligan Golf Association nine years ago, a fun golf club that many hold as testament to the man's lighter outlook on life.

His friend Graham Doven said, "He told me many years ago that if he died, he would want his friends and family from Thailand, the country that he loved and adopted as his home, to enjoy his restaurants, food and wine as a celebration of his life. I think they will definitely respect his wishes, but for now we will miss him."

Services were held at Wat Cherng Talay from 7 pm.

Dane dies in hotel reception

KARON: Danish tourist Finn Hansen, 54, was found dead on April 3 in the lobby of the Welcome Inn Hotel, where he had been staying since March 18.

"He was sitting in a chair in the hotel lobby for three hours before anyone noticed he was dead," Capt Theerawut Thep-Luen of Chalong Police told the Gazette.

As there was no evidence of foul play, police expect that Mr Hansen died from natural causes, he said.

"It's possible that he suffered a seizure before his death," Capt Theerawut said.

Mr Hansen's body was sent to Vachira Phuket Hospital for autopsy and the Danish authorities have been notified of the death.

In preparation for Songkran, about 100 Tourist Police officers and volunteers attended a sea rescue training session at the Royal Phuket City Hotel on March 30.



Our tropical paradise

he government of former Prime Minister Surayud Chulanond commissioned the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security (MSO) to conduct an in-depth statistical analysis to quantify levels of "human security" in Thailand.

Using a set of 56 individual statistical parameters grouped into 10 different categories, the MSO recently announced the results of the study, which it calls the Composite Human Security Index survey for 2006 (CHSI/ 2006).

The most surprising result of the statistical exercise, at least to island residents, is that Phuket residents were determined to be at greater risk of violent crimes and theft than residents of any of the other Southern provinces - including the three southern border provinces of Yala, Pattani and Narathiwat.

Such crimes include murder, robbery and various kinds of theft, rape and other forms of physical and sexual assault.

WHAT DOES IT **ALL MEAN?**

The overall CHSI index for Leach province is calculated by averaging 10 different CHSI indicators: housing; health; education; employment; personal security; family life; social support; society and culture; justice and human rights; politics and good governance.

Overall, Phuket came 34th in the nation, while the coastal province of Samut Songkhram near Bangkok took first place and the strife-torn province of Pattani

comparative survey conducted by the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security for 2006 found that Phuket ranks statistically in the middle of the Thailand's 76 provinces in terms of overall security and quality of life, but comes dead last when it comes to one key indicator: "personal security".

For overall CHSI, Samut Songkram came first with a score of 0.9757, while Pattani finished last with a dismal 0.1371.

Phuket's overall CHSI rating of 0.7120 indicated a "medium" level of human se-

curity, K. Phannee reported.

These figures are in turn divided by the number of households to calculate a number of cases-per-household figures for each class of crime.

These are collectively combined to calculate the CHSI for

A computer program called Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS), which can be run on Microsoft Excel software, is in turn used to calculate the overall CHSI.

While noting the demographic factors that contributed

to Phuket's extremely low CHSI for personal security, K. Phannee urged all government officers at the security committee meeting to have their agencies work together to improve the security situation on the island.

The MSO plans to conduct migrant labor, he said.

a nationwide CHSI survey annually as a way of noting nationwide trends.

CHSI data will also be included in key performance indicators (KPIs) developed for each province.

These will be made available for use in government planning. The CHSI/2006 study was the first nationwide study of its kind the MSO had conducted since it was formed in 2002, she said.

K. Phannee admitted that it had taken a long time to compile all of the data and said that she was unsure when CHSI/2007 results would become available.

Also attending the security council meeting when the CHSI figures were released was Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pol Maj Gen Decha Butnampeth, who has long lobbied Royal Thai Police headquarters in Bangkok for more officers and budget as a way of providing better security – but to little avail

He told fellow committee members that Phuket's CHSIs were not reliable indicators of the actual situation on the ground, especially the CHSI for "personal security".

Provinces with high concentrations of unregistered, migrant laborers comprise the huge majority of provinces with the worst CHSI ratings for personal security, he said.

These include other common tourist destinations such as Chonburi (home to Pattaya and 74th overall) as well as highly-industrialized provinces such as Pathum Thani (75th); Rayong (73rd) and Samut Sakhon (72nd), he said

All of these are magnets for migrant labor, he said.

Fowl play suspected in local election

ANG THONG: Police Region 1 free from his bonds at about 5 am take personal responsibility for the are leaving no stone unturned in their attempt to bring to justice a vicious gang of youths who abducted 1,500 waterfowl from a local politician, in what police believe could be a politically motivated ducknapping.

At about 3 am on March 28, six young men, some on motorcycles, some in a six-wheeled truck, pulled up at a duck farm in

Village 2 Tambon Yan Seu in Ang Thong Muang district.

The youths grabbed the lone security guard, 44-year-old Reuangsak Khrueakaow, and bound him hand and foot before administering a savage beating for good measure.

With the security guard taken

care of, the youths turned their attention to the not-inconsiderable task of getting the 1,500 ducks from the coop into the back of the truck.

When all the birds were safely on the truck bed, the gang sped away amidst the sound of startled quacking.

When a badly bruised K. Reuangsak managed to wriggle

that morning, he called Ang Thong Police to report the crime.

When police learned that the missing fowl belonged to a Lamlee Noinongwun, deputy president of Bang Phlap Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor), they jumped into

Provincial Police, said, "The criminals are probably from within the world of duck rearing as they knew how to properly transport the birds and also knew where K. Lamlee kept his ducks, which is a quiet and secluded location.

"We now taking statements from wit-

nesses who saw the truck [used in the robbery]."

Gen Thanisak added that his superior, Police Region 1 Commissioner Lt Gen Rachot Yensuang, was also following the case closely and had urged him to rapidly bring it to a close.

He therefore ordered Muang District Superintendent Col Wareeroj Kongkanphai to

case.

Col Wareeroj said that he had contacted the Provincial Livestock Office for information on local duck-keepers who could be involved in the crime.

He has also ordered police and Volunteer Defence Corp officers to inspect all duck farms in the area to look for any ducks acting suspiciously.

If two flocks of ducks are introduced to each other, they will not mix and will stay as two separate flocks, Col Wareeroj explained.

Police have received tipoffs from confidential informants indicating who the gang of youths are and believe the mastermind behind the plot is likely to be one of K. Lamlee's competitors in the duck-rearing business, but are not yet ruling out a political motive for the ducknapping. K. Lamlee was preparing to run for another term as OrBorTor deputy president, Col Wareeroj added.

K. Lamlee told reporters that the ducks were worth about 150,000 baht.

K. Lamlee added that he didn't want to believe that the theft was politically motivated, but admitted that he did have some problems with political ri-

A source told the Gazette's Thai-language sister-paper *Kom* ChadLuek that the motive behind the great duck theft was to intimidate K. Lamlee ahead of the upcoming OrBorTor elections.

The perpetrators were a group of youths from Tambon Pho Rang Nok in Pho Thong District under the control of one of K. Lamlee's political rivals, the source explained.

Thailand Post launches provincial stamps

PHUKET: Thailand Post on April 2 launched a series of stamps depicting the official seals of 10 provinces.

The first stamp shows the seal of Nakhon Ratchasima province. The statue of Khunying Mo is seen in front of Chumphon Gate. Khunying Mo was the wife of the deputy governor of Nakhon Ratchasima when King Anuvong of Vientiane attempted to seize the province while the governor was away.

Khunying Mo gathered a rebel army to fight the invaders.

The second design shows the Nakhon Sri Thammarat seal, which depicts a stupa emanating rays of light. The stupa image is surrounded by the 12 signs of the Thai zodiac. In the past, the province had 12 colonies, each represented by a zodiac symbol.

The third stamp shows Wiman, a mythological castle found in heaven, which is the seal of Nakhon Sawan province. The gods are believed to live in heaven and those who make merit are said to be reborn in Wiman.

The seal of Nonthaburi province adorns the fourth stamp, showing earthenware, an ancient product of Nonthaburi that is still used to this day.

On the fifth stamp is the seal of Narathiwat province. A boat with the image of an elephant on its sail symbolizes that the marine trade plays an important role in the province.

An usuparatch bull carry-

ing the pagoda of Phrathat Chae Haeng is the symbol of Nan province and the image on the sixth stamp. The rulers of Nan and Phrae were, at one time, brothers. They met on a mountain to discuss the border between their lands. The ruler of Nan traveled to the meeting on the back of a buffalo.

The seal of Buri Ram province is the subject of the seventh stamp. Phanom Rung sandstone castle stands in the background. An angel, believed to invoke happiness and alleviate misery, dances in front of the castle.

On the eighth stamp is the seal of Pathum Thani province. A pink lotus flower with two ears of rice bending over it refer to Pathum Thani as the perfect place for agriculture.

The Kuha Karuhas pavilion is the symbol of Prachuap Khiri Khan province. Behind the pavilion is the island of Koh Lak in Prachuap Bay, a historical center of administration.

The final stamp shows the seal of Prachin Buri – a bodhi tree. When a group from India went to the province, they brought bodhi trees, which is the same species of tree under which Buddha achieved enlightenment at Mahabodhi Temple.

The stamps, measuring 35 millimeters by 35mm, are available at all 10 of Phuket's post offices for three baht each, with 900,000 stamps produced per province.





onvicted murder mastermind and former top cop Chalor Kerdthet is turning stool pigeon and will tell all about the controversial 630-million-baht Saudi gem heist that has soured relations between the two countries for two decades.

Chalor says he'll take the witness stand in a court if required.

He made the pledge to Justice Minister Sompong Amornwiwat, who visited him in Klong Prem Central Prison in Nonthaburi on April 3.

The former Central Investigation Bureau deputy chief is serving life for masterminding the killing of the wife and son of a gem dealer involved in the saga.

The dealer was the chief prosecution witness.

A Thai house-servant at the Riyadh palace of Prince Faisal, son of King Fahd, stole kilograms of gems while the prince was on holiday in 1989.

He fled to his native Lampang province, where he was arrested. He was sentenced to five years in jail.

A box of jewels was returned to the prince, who determined that nearly 80% of the loot had disappeared. Some had been replaced by crude fakes. Many of the stolen stones, worth millions, are still missing – as is a Saudi businessman.

Saudi Arabia downgraded relations in 1990, after three Saudi diplomats were murdered in Bangkok in separate incidents. The move affected many Thai workers who worked in the oilrich country.

Justice Minister Sompong reopened the case last week, hoping to end the rift between the two countries.

"I am willing to testify as a witness if requested," said Chalor, who has been behind bars for 14 years and had several appeals turned down.

Chalor says he's not talking in return for freedom. "I want to help solve the case... and I have been friends with the minister for a long time," he said.

but the law requires they withstand pressure much lower than that," he said.

Rainstorms have uprooted more billboards than the few reported in the news, he added.

"These incidents become news only when they kill," Dr Penneung said.

Pervert potion promotion.

The Paveena Hongsakul Foundation is sending samples of drinks allegedly laced with aphrodisiacs to the Food and Drug Administration for analysis, fearing they could be used by sex predators on unsuspecting

The foundation, established to protect women and children from abuse, has taken issue with orange juice and instant coffee products that carry the following message in Thai script: "Warning: Drink components have strong sexual-stimulation effect."

The feared abuse has occurred in at least two cases reported to the foundation, but victims refuse to press charges, said founder K. Paveena.

"We want the FDA to clarify if there is any legal restriction on the sales of such drinks containing aphrodisiacs. It can be harmful to unsuspecting women if sex predators surreptitiously and maliciously give them the drink," she said.

K. Paveena demanded legal action if the drinks are sold without FDA approval.

Fay, part owner of Sabai Properties, was taken into custody with four charges against him: foreign ownership of land in Thailand, using a Thai nominee to own land, subdividing land without a developer's license and developing land without a license.

Fay has stated that he has done nothing wrong, has followed all the correct procedures and holds all the proper legal paperwork.

Police have questioned Fay's staff over the past 18 months following an accusation that he was part of the notorious Bandidos gang. His arrest comes after the release of another alleged gang member, Crispin Paton-Smith, who was set free after the prosecution failed to present any evidence against him.

Fay claims to have never been a gang member. His name was included on a document produced by discredited prosecution witness, Eric Remsdyke, who had filed allegations implicating him at the same time that charges had been brought against other well-known business people identified by Mr Remsdyke.

"I have always been a lawabiding citizen. I've been here for over 11 years and never on a tourist visa," said Fay. "I have always had the correct documentation, visas and work permits as dictated by lawyers."

The case has caused a lot of controversy over the rights of foreigners to purchase and sell land using 51% Thai ownership.

Fay entered the property business on Samui seven years ago with his Thai business partner, Samui-born Adisak Chittheap, who owned 51% of Sabai Properties.

"Adisak has been my legiti-

mate business partner and we have always followed the advice of our Thai lawyers regarding correct procedure. I took legal advice from trusted Thai lawyers and now I'm being punished for it," Fay commented.

A court date has not been set for

the hearing, but the case's outcome is eagerly awaited due to its possible influence on cases of a similar nature.

Aussie woman raped. Koh Samui police on March 26 responded to reports from one of the international hospitals that a foreign woman had been raped.

Investigating police questioned the 19-year-old Australian woman, who said she had been sleeping in her room at the Samuang House Resort while her friend slept in an adjacent room.

The woman told police that a man carrying a knife entered her room and raped her before fleeing with her cellphone, cash and passport.

The *Bangkok Post* has since reported that a 26-year-old man was arrested and charged with the rape.



Ferry price increase. April 1 will see a rise in the price of ferry tickets from mainland Surat Thani to Koh Samui.

Damri Boonjing, Vice-Governor of Surat Thani province and head of the local committee for boat transport, confirmed that approval has been granted after a petition from operators to increase the fares due to the rising price of fuel.

However, V/Gov Damri said that the increase will not be dramatic and should not drastically affect paying customers.

The new fares for adult foot passengers will increase to 130 baht while students will pay 60 baht per journey. Passengers with motorized vehicles will have to pay 345 baht.

Full moon murder. Koh Phangan's monthly full moon party saw another violent incident on March 7 when 24-year-old Indian native Chetan Dadhwal was killed while trying to break up a gang fight.

Witnesses told investigators

that a large crowd of Thai youngsters congregated around a fight between a 15-year-old Thai male named only as "Sahachert" and a 14-year-old Thai male, who police declined to name due to his age.

The 14-year-old was allegedly holding a knife when Mr Dadhwal tried to intervene, but was subsequently attacked with the weapon.

Sahachert was also seriously injured during the attack, suffering lacerations to his face and neck that required more than 30 stitches.

Both victims were rushed to Bandon International Hospital on the island, where Mr Dadhwal died from his injuries.

Representatives from Bandon Hospital reported that Mr Dadhwal had stab wounds to the

left side of his chest, to his right arm and his right cheek and neck.

An investigating team led by Pol Lt Gen Thanee Tawitsee, commander of Provincial Police Region 8, traveled to Koh Pha-ngan by helicopter to interview seven youths being held in relation to the crime.

Police have taken statements from witnesses.

The prime suspect has denied all charges.

Princess visits Pha-ngan. Samui's sister party island Koh Phangan played host to a visitor from the British Royal family last month. Princess Beatrice, daughter of Prince Andrew, Duke of York, spent more than a week re-

laxing on some of the island's beaches.

Princess Beatrice was said to have been with friends on a three-week tour of Thailand.

Two British Police guards kept watch over the princess and her friends, who stayed at the Morning Star resort on Ban Tai Beach.

Resort owners K. Jita and K. Arun were said to be taken with the princess and prepared flowers and special greeting cards for her with only two hours notice of her arrival.

The pair said the princess had impeccable manners during her stay in a simple wooden bungalow on the beach. "She was very polite and made a point of taking her plates and glasses back to the reception after she had finished with them, while her other friends just left them on the beach," said K. Jita.

Aside from relaxing, the princess was also spotted enjoying herself at the full moon party.

Visa run bus accident. A popular minibus used to ferry people to and from Malaysia to obtain visa stamps crashed, injuring several people, including the driver

and tour operator.

The tour company, Herbert's Visa Run, was on its way to the border when the driver lost control reportedly after one of the minibus' tires blew out, causing the vehicle to flip over.

Passengers were tossed around when seats that had been bolted to the frame came loose.

Four passengers on the bus were treated for leg fractures, including two who

suffered fractures to the femur bones of both legs.



Policeman slays his superiors

Narathiwat police corporal on March 31 shot dead two of his commanding officers after being reprimanded for gambling and poor discipline.

Witnesses reported that at 7:10 pm, Cpl Thakeng Moonmek, a Crime Suppression Squad leader at Sri Sakhon Police Station in Narathiwat's Muang District, pulled up outside a restaurant opposite the station where his two commanding officers, Maj Sawek Phukphasuk and Maj Aphiwat Khotwong, were eating.

Cpl Thakeng walked up to the officers' table, drew his pistol and shot Maj Sawek in the face. Maj Aphiwat attempted to return fire but was gunned down. Cpl Thakeng then shot Maj Sawek two more times before trying to escape.

However, other officers in the restaurant managed to subdue him and place him under arrest. Maj Aphiwat was rushed to hospital, but died en route. Maj Sawek died at the scene.

Col Chok Chawanwiwat, deputy commander Narathiwat Provincial Police, said that before the incident, Maj Sawek had called Cpl Thakeng to his office to speak to him about disciplinary issues. Maj Sawek rebuked Cpl Thakeng about turning up late and missing shifts and also ordered him to stop gambling as it was damaging the reputation of the police force. Maj Sawek warned him that he was likely to face disciplinary action over his conduct.

Officers reported that after the warning, Cpl Thakeng wandered around the station looking troubled before going home. He then returned with his gun to shoot Maj Sawek, Col Chok said.

Cpl Thakeng was likely to have been worried that he could be dismissed from the police force and the stress from this combined with his gambling problems may have led him to shoot his commanding officers, Col Chok added.



Col Chok Chawanwiwat, deputy commander of Narathiwat Provincial Police, announced the arrest of nine suspects on drug- and insurgency-related charges on April 3. The suspects were caught in an early morning search involving 700 police, soldiers and volunteers covering five districts of the restive province.

Maj Sawek was an Acting Crime Suppression Inspector at Sri Sakhon Station. Before taking on the role two months ago, he had worked as an inspector at Narathiwat Provincial Police Headquarters Security Center. He also served in the Border Patrol Police in Su-ngai Padi district and Surin province.

Maj Aphiwat had been a Criminal Investigation Inspector at Sri Sakhon since October and had previously served with the Border Patrol Police in Udon Thani.

Getting better? Army Commander-in-Chief Gen Anupong Paochinda on April 3 said that the situation in the Deep South had improved and that the army does not have to request special assistance from the government in its attempts to end the insurgency.

He said civilian officials, police and soldiers have been satisfactorily cooperating in their missions to end the violence.

He added that violent incidents in the region had declined during the past four months and it appeared the number of attacks would continue to fall.

Election violence. The President of Krut Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*) in Kanchanadit district, Surat Thani, was seriously injured after an attempted assassination early on April 5.

Kowit Wacharasawat, 42, was shot three times while sitting in his pickup, waiting for his wife after the couple had attended the funeral of a relative, Yothin Wacharasawat, in Village 6 Tambon Changsai.

Funeral guests rushed K. Kowit to Surat Thani Hospital to be treated for his injuries. However, after spotting a man acting suspiciously near K. Kowit's room, relatives began to fear that he may be at risk of another at-

tempt on his life and asked for Surat Thani Muang District Police to send plainclothes officers to guard him.

Later that day, K. Kowit was transferred to a hospital in Bangkok, where relatives believed he would be safer.

Police said that there were at least two gunmen who waited in ambush for K. Kowit to leave the funeral.

Police believe the attempted murder was connected to the upcoming elections for Surat Thani Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) due to be held this month.

K. Kowit worked as a canvasser for one of the three candidates standing for election as the *OrBorJor* council member for Kanchadit district Constituency 3. K. Kowit's support in the election could be a key factor in the outcome of the race as he is a popular figure in the area and about four months ago won a second term as president of Krut *OrBorTor* in a landslide victory, police said.

Bike ring busted. Police in Chumphon bust a ring of motorcycle thieves after catching one of them driving a stolen bike to the Burmese border on April 1.

At 12:30 am, Chetsak Thanabat, 28, was stopped by Sen Sgt Maj Phinit Phonwacharin as he was driving a motorbike with no registration plate past a police checkpoint in Baan Thung Sawan Village 7, in Lamae district.

Under interrogation, Chetsak confessed that the motorbike was stolen and that he had been paid to drive it from Chumphon to Kraburi district in Ranong, from where it was to be smuggled across the border to Burma.

From Chetsak's testimony, police seized another stolen motorbike and arrested three other suspects: Suriya Srisuwan, 21, Phairat Naowhat, 28, and Aekarin Mukda, 31.

Navy boys are good to Phuket

ast week, three US Navy ships made a historical call to port. It was the first time that the three warships, USS Hopper, USS Ingraham and USS Port Royal, had anchored in the same port to give the 900-plus enlisted personnel and officers some wellearned R and R in Phuket.

While the ships were at port, groups of seamen could be seen around the island, letting loose on some of the tourist attractions. One group of officers donated their time and skills to their host community by taking part in community relations projects, or "comrel" as they call it.

On April 4, a group of nine officers clad in navy-blue overalls and led by their on-board Southern Baptist Chaplain, Mark Haley, rolled into Baan Kamala School to begin sanding down and varnishing desks that curious students were bringing down from their classrooms.

Baan Kamala School is by the beachfront and was destroyed in the 2004 tsunami, prompting the Phuket Has Been Good To Us Foundation to focus its charitable efforts there.

The comrel projects were co-ordinated by American expat Brad Kenny and USN Naval Attaché Captain Walter Bruce Watson Jr on behalf of the foundation, which works with local educators to improve the opportunities of young people by funding English-language education in government schools.

"We've done about 16 comrels so far," said Chaplain Haley, adding, "We really just want to bring goodwill as ambassadors of our country."

Some of the other comrel projects they have undertaken at



various ports of call include painta recent project to help transport distributed to schools, but the losupplies and get them to the students," he said.

The group of volunteers ranged in age and rank, each a specialist in a particular field, including a helicopter pilot who had rooted out a pair of old flying greens for the day of dusty desk work.

They made quick work of sanding down the desks with power tools while school kids brought desks from classrooms to add to the "assembly line."

On Sunday, Chaplain Haley and volunteer crew members pitched in at the Life Home Project, a shelter for orphans, HIV-positive mothers and their children. This time the volunteers brought a bit more order to the grounds by clearing weeds, trimming hedges and planting fruit trees. They later joined the mothers and their children for snacks.

"It's really good to see these opportunities and we're grateful to the Rotary club for their help in co-ordinating this," said Chaplain Haley, adding that each of the volunteers are specialists in particular fields. "Whether they are weapons specialists, electronic engineers, chefs or medical personnel, they are able to contribute their skills to the community projects we undertake and they are glad to make a positive contribution away from the wartime environment," he said.

"We are actually on our way home after a long time at sea, but it's both exciting and important for us to build community relations in the ports we stop at. It's important for people around the world to know that as individuals, we have the best of intentions and are here to help," said Chap-

"Having experienced the trauma and grief that comes with working in conflict zones, it's also good to be able to take on this kind of supportive role in the community. It's very rewarding to know we can make a difference in a positive way," he added.

Chaplain Haley explained that a lot more of the ships' crew members were planning to participate in the comrel project at the school, but the first "mail drop" in several months a few hours earlier meant that many officers were preoccupied with pouring over letters from loved ones.

"Doing these community projects is a moral booster, but mail drops are rare and the fact that the three ships are in port together means that friends on separate vessels can meet up again for the first time in many months," Chaplain Haley said.

"We've been on board for about six months already and are hoping to get home in about another two months, but we could be called upon for operations at any time. We're at the 'tip of the spear' at the moment, meaning we're in a high state of readiness. That doesn't just mean we are ready to jump into wartime action, but to be prepared to carry out humanitarian projects and community relations projects such as these. It really depends on what we're called to do next," he added.

CSSR Ford is one of the newer recruits, joining the navy less than a year ago. On board the USS Port Royal he works as a chef, but took the opportunity to join the group of volunteers so he could experience some of the culture. "It's easy to go crazy and spend loads of money when we make a port call, so I wanted to do something positive and see something of the culture while I am here," he said.

The three warships anchored off Makham Bay made for a dramatic backdrop to the tropical vista and Chaplain Haley expressed his confidence in the high-tech defense capabilities the ships can provide for their host country.

At just over 10 years old, the USS Hopper (DDG-70), based at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, is the youngest of the battleship trio and weighs in at nearly 9,000 tons when full. She's 154 meters long and can carry her 338-strong crew over 4,000 nautical miles at 20 knots. She can also carry a single SH-60 Sea Hawk helicopter. The Arleigh Burke-class guided missile destroyer sails with the motto: Aude et effice (Dare and Do).

The USS Ingraham (FFG-61) is the fourth US Navy vessel named in honor of Captain Duncan Ingraham (1802–1891), whose career in the US Navy began as a midshipman when he was 10 years old. The USS *Ingraham (FFG-61)* is classified as an Oliver Hazard Perry-class frigate. She is based at NS Everett, Washington and was launched in 1988. She carries a crew of 236, including pilots for two Sea Hawk helicopters.

The USS Port Royal is also based at Pearl Harbor, and is the largest of the three ships, displacing 9,600 tons when fully loaded with a crew of 360 and two Sirkorsky SH-60 Seahawk LAMPS III helicopters. She's 173 meters long and cuts through the water at 32.5 knots.

ne mouthful of K. Kacky's *khao ka moo* (stewed pork leg on rice) and I thought, "Holy moly! Where have you been all my life?"

Chiang Mai native Apissada "Kacky" Putyot, 42, serves this culinary wonder daily at Ka Moo Boraan Restaurant on Phra Phuket Kaew Rd. Customers fill up the place from 7 am until 5 pm, but with just seven tables available, you may not be able to find a seat during the lunch-hour rush.

The restaurant has attracted a large following of loyal Thais and foreigners who have made frequent visits during the eight years the eatery has been open.

K. Kacky opened the restaurant with the help of her husband, Treechai "Ning" Yodmuang – and together, the pair serve up their tasty treats seven days a week.

K. Kacky worked with her aunt in a restaurant in Patong for two years before she had the idea to pursue her own *khao ka moo* venture. K. Ning is also a culinary veteran, having spent several years working as a chef on a cruise ship.

Non-Thai-speaking foreigners need not worry about placing an order because both K. Ning and K. Kacky are proficient in English.



The restaurant may look average, but appearances are dececeptive. The taste is exceptional – a Chiang Mai family recipe passed down from generation to generation that in Phuket only K. Kacky and her husband know. The secret ingredient is a Chinese herb mixed in with the broth in which the pork is cooked.

"It was my own idea to add the herb. I also use lemongrass to make the dish smell better. I add a bit of garlic, as well as galangal for soaking up the fat in the soup, which then makes it less oily," she added.

Working every day to feed hungry islanders leaves K. Kacky and her husband with little time to spare. "Since we started working here, we haven't had a holiday. There's no way we can ever get sick – or die!" laughed K. Kacky.

Kacky.

"We start cooking the pork leg late in the evening, boiling it for about six hours before it's ready to be served at 7 am the

next morning," she added.

K. Kacky and K. Ning wake at 5 am every day and get straight to work by cooking huge quantities of rice. Once the rice

is done, the *khao ka moo* is ready to be dished out to the hordes of breakfast-seekers.

The long period of time the couple spend preparing their food is what makes each dish so soft and rich in flavor, said K. Kacky. "Every day, we prepare 25 kilograms of pork. If it's a busy day, we might sell all of it before noon," she said.

As well as *khao ka moo*, another popular dish is the boiled-entrails soup. For foreigners, the most popular dish is *khao ka moo* with *moo krob* (crispy pork).

"I have one group of farang

customers who come here often. They always order *ka moo*, with no fat and a side of *moo krob*," she said.

"We prepare our *moo krob* by using fresh lemon juice to ferment the meat. This makes it crispy on the outside, but soft on the inside," she said.

One large serving with all the trimmings will set you back 50 baht. Even if you have the appetite of a rhinoceros, you won't need a second helping because each dish is sufficiently filling.





First lady of the road

reshly arrived in her husband's native Phuket, after 20 years in Bangkok, where she had worked for a pharmaceutical company, Suwan "Patty" Petchwang, 51, originally from Prachuap Khiri Khan, didn't have a clue where to start looking for work.

They had come to Phuket as her husband had simply wanted to come home. "At the time we didn't know what to do for a living in Phuket. One day we were doing the paperwork to transfer our car registration from Bangkok to Phuket at the Provincial Land Transportation Office and we started chatting to some guy.

"We were discussing various work options on the island when he suggested that we get into the here are 45 metered taxis in Phuket, but only one is driven by a woman. In high season, Suwan 'Patty' Petchwang can make up to 70,000 baht a month driving a taxi. But it wasn't always so. Rewind 13 years and K. Patty decided that it was time for a change of career. Here, K. Patty tells **Semacote Suganya** what life's like behind the wheel in Phuket.

tuk-tuk business. He said that it was very profitable and offered to sell us his tuk-tuk, "Why not?" we thought so we agreed to buy it off him for 160,000 baht," K. Patty explained.

But it was not to be plain sailing. "Not long after we bought the tuk-tuk, my husband had to leave Phuket and move first to Bangkok and then Saudi Arabia to work as a factory manager. He had to go because we had just bought a new house and had a mortgage to pay.

"Apart from when he came to visit us every six months or so, I was on my own. Money was short to say the least and with him gone there was no-one to drive the tuk-tuk. I just used it to take the kids to school," K. Patty said.

During her school rounds, K. Patty would often come

across people in need of a ride, asking her to take them somewhere. Although she put a sign on the outside of the tuk-tuk indicating that it was not in service, most people did not see it and tried to hail her.

"For a while I did not pick anyone up. Besides selling a little fruit here and there, I ran private errands in the tuk-tuk," K. Patty explained.

"One day I drove past Robinson shopping center and yet another group of people tried to hail me. This time I decided to pick them up. I charged them 5 baht each, which was the minimum fare back then.

"I was the first woman to drive a tuk-tuk in Phuket and many people on the island found it a little peculiar I guess, but I just got on with it.

"Usually, I would park in front of Coca Restaurant, opposite Robinson, which was a good spot as it was never short of fares. But once I got to know the area better and learned to find my way around town, I became more adventurous and started to venture further afield.

"Often, I'd pick up fares at Tilok Pier and Sangrat Pier near Koh Sireh, which were both near my house. I'd take them to Patong, which at that time cost only 150 baht. Trips around Phuket Town were just 45 baht."

Though business was occasionally good, K. Patty struggled to get fares in the low season to keep her afloat. Sometimes she would have only two fares a day, making as little as 70 baht. After eight years, she decided to sell the tuk-tuk and buy a taxi with a meter. That was two years ago.

"Because I sold the tuk-tuk, I was no longer allowed to park at the tuk-tuk rank at Rassada Pier. Also, as with the tuk-tuk, sometimes I would get only two fares a day. Another problem I soon discovered was that metered taxis in Phuket are different to those in Bangkok in that they are not allowed to pick up

clients everywhere," she said.

"In Phuket taxis have to stick to designated pick up areas and taxi ranks. You can't just pick up any client off the street. At some hotels, you are allowed to drop off clients only, not pick them up. Other hotels have their own cars or have made deals with certain taxi drivers who are the only people permitted to standby outside. The only official taxi rank for metered taxis is the one located at the airport," she explained.

The competition among Phuket's taxi drivers is fierce and at first it was a struggle for K. Patty. "Back then, it was unusual to be a female taxi driver. I was the only woman in the business down here, but it was often an advantage. Many people liked having a female driver, which made other taxi drivers unhappy with me. Many women clients preferred to ride with me because I am a woman," she said.

"Others chose me as they thought that a lady driver would be more polite and a safer driver. In the beginning, sometimes other taxi drivers would chase after my clients trying to get them to get in their cars instead. They were jealous of me.

"When the clients declined because they said they felt safer with me, it would make them really angry. It took a while before they started to accept me and understand that I was not going to go away," K. Patty said.

Today, everyone in the business knows K. Patty, or the "Iron lady", as her male colleagues call her, and have accepted her into their fraternity. "These days, they say that they are glad to have me," K. Patty said.

Though business is good, there are many costs in running a taxi business. "I have been driving a metered taxi for two years now. I bought it on finance for 800,000 baht and paying it off with 8,100 baht a month over 10 years.

"Though the money is good, driving a taxi is hard work. Taking someone to Kata takes one hour and then you have the trip back, which takes another hour. Depending on the length of trips, I have four to five fares a day, which makes me from 30,000 to 70,000 baht a month, depending on the season," she said.

"If I could, I would like to adjust the meter price and make it slightly higher," she explained.

Driving a taxi is not pure profit. "We charge about 420 baht for most trips from the airport. Out of that we have to pay 40 baht to the taxi rank. After petrol, you are left with a profit of about 300 baht. Then you need to pay for maintenance of the car and other expenses," she said.


"I once picked up a family from a Patong hotel who wanted to go to the airport. As they got out, they forgot a bag on the front seat. I went after them and returned it. It turned out to be full of cash and jewelry and they were very pleased to get it back. They wanted to give me a cash reward, but I refused and I told them that it's my duty to help my clients.

"The wife cried and gave me a big hug. What stuck in my mind was when she said she would remember me for the rest of her life. It makes me happy when clients praise me for being such a good driver," she said.





Tata closes deal on Jaguar, Land Rover buyout

t last, the deal is done: Tata of India, a giant conglomerate, has finally concluded the takeover of Land Rover and Jaguar from Ford.

The Tata Group comprises 98 operating companies in seven business sectors: information systems and communications, engineering, materials, services, energy, consumer products and chemicals.

Tata recently launched the "1 lakh rupees" (100,000 rupees) car called the Nano, although it is unlikely to ever be exported to other markets, for safety and other compliance reasons.

In the accounting year 2006 to 2007, Tata had revenues of US\$28.8 billion.

Ford bought Jaguar in 1992 for US\$1.2 billion, but never went significantly into profit with the brand, despite pumping millions of dollars into the iconic British luxury-car maker.

Land Rover, the legendary

4x4 manufacturer, was acquired from BMW when German automaker disposed of the ailing brand in 2000.

Although Land Rover is profitable, the company requires huge investment if it is to move forward.

There has been some concern, notably

sented an obvious argument for carrying capacity.

Volume isn't usually a concern in sea kayaking, a highly ecological paddling and camping activity, but I came to Asia to introduce environmental awareness, professional standards and ideas for sustainability.

Common sense dictates that the capacity of Phang Nga's cave system is about 120 people per day. The caves are extremely narrow and access opens and closes with the tide.

I stopped taking bookings at 50 people per day – huge for sea kayaking. It was a fateful decision. Had I continued growing, no copycats would have started. But our first copycat did start, on January 1, 1993.

I saw the impending doom, worked with the park and in 1994, a local Thai-language newspaper quoted the park director as saying that up to 120 people per day is logical and responsible.


There were four companies at the time. I agreed to lower my volume by one-third so everybody could take two trips of 15 people per day in two different escort boats.

Since then, however, Phang Nga's sea kayaking industry has let its standards slip. Many owners are travel agents who haven't even been on their own trips. Two owners are actually speedboat operators.

Thai paddling isn't sea kayaking. There is no such thing as a "sea canoe" – I invented the name as a joke. Owners make no attempt at learning the activity they copy for money. There is no interest in the graceful art of sea kayaking or protecting the fragile marine environment.

Thailand is blessed with world-class natural treasure. Instead of honoring this gift, the travel industry often works

against it. It's just one symptom of a boom-town mentality, killing the goose that lays the golden egg.

Hotel tour counters often book exclusive clientele onto mass-tourism-kayaking trips. Highlights of these tours include traffic jams inside caves, feeding monkeys bananas where bananas don't grow and tossing rubbish that kills marine life.

The group tours will continue to roll in as long as tourist arrivals are the primary aim on the island.

How are we going to explain this to our children in 20 vears?

I researched the carrying capacities of other famous destinations. A properly maintained Phang Nga could rival Machu Pichu, so when Machu Pichu's carrying capacity came up in a discussion recently, I devoured it.

Man-made Machu Pichu in Peru and Nature-made Phang Nga are spectacular. Before 2001, both suffered the negative impact of uncontrolled mass tour-

So how did Peru turn around Machu Picchu?

If Peru didn't do something, Unesco would have pulled Machu Picchu's World Heritage status. Peru did the right thing in developing a natural-resources-management plan similar to those solutions for

Phang Nga presented in previous Gray Area columns. The plan looked as fol-

- **1.** Strict limit of 500 people per day, including porters, guides and cooks. This limits tourists to about 150 per day.
- **2.** No groups of more than 16

3. Only trained and approved tour companies can visit the area.

4. US\$50 charge per person.

- 5. Tickets issued with names and passport details, available for inspection at all times.
- **6.** Camping in designated areas
- **7.** Trekking only from 5:30 am to 7 pm (prevents poaching and fence jumpers).
- 8. No litter, mobile phones, sound systems, pets, antisocial behavior or food in ruins. All solid waste must be packed out.
- **9.** Tour companies must provide portable fuel for cooking and heating.

To add to this, payments are no longer accepted at registry and entry control points.

To protect our planet, the next generation must be committed to respecting natural marvels. When we enter pristine environments, we must exercise the same respect as when entering a temple or mosque. That's difficult when some of the people controlling entries respect mostly

I once asked a competitor why he is in sea kayaking. "We just go out to have a party in nature," he replied.

It's going to take serious inter-departmental coordination to save Phang Nga from mass tourism and preserve marine resources for the future.

At Machu Picchu, Unesco provided the wakeup call. We are all responsible for our own ac-

If people want to exploit Thailand's beautiful side by promoting low-end group tours, we need to develop a sustainable nature-protection plan first.

Phuket deserves sustainable quality. Thailand doesn't have the management courage of Machu Picchu or Puerto Princesa, but we can still do better. Right now, our image is trash to the global community.

Paddle guides and owners should be licensed in environmental responsibility and other disciplines. Travel agents need awareness training. It won't diminish their greed, but at least they would confront the conse quences of their actions.

Tour managers ought to go on their own trips at least once a year and licensed guides should receive a minimum wage of 500 baht per day.

Most people respond positively once they know the facts. There are many good guides out there, but they just need a bit of training and direction.

Let's properly collect entry fees, report numbers and put the money into protecting Phang Nga, Krabi and Phi Phi by creating a conservation ethic. Start at the top and it might work.





Monk sees 'The Way Things Are'

hailand's collection of expat writers has produced hundreds of titles over the years, but most fall into the same boring category: fictitious tales dealing with familiar topics such as beer, bar girls and sick buffaloes.

Given this literary landscape, *Monk* in the Mountain (Tam Song Ta Meditation Sanctuary, Nakhon Ratchasima, 2007, 202pp, 495 baht) by Ajahn Sumano Bikkhu really stands out: a lucid, articulate and and often entertaining look into the nature of reality as explained by the first Western monk to be ordained in the tradition of Thai forest monks.

Ajahn Sumano, born as Jeffrey Phillips in Chicago, studied law and started his own business before embarking on a spiritual journey some 30 years ago. He first came to Thailand to study under the revered Ajahn Chaa at Wat Nong Pah Pong, a forest monastery in Ubon Ratchathani province.

For the past 20 years, Ajahn Sumano has spent most of his time in solitude at his Double-Eyed Cave Retreat in the Khao Yai mountains, northeast of Bangkok.

I have to admit that when Monk in the Mountain was put before me, my initial reaction was: "A monk living in a cave on top of a mountain – how cliché is that?" It reminded me of the old "What is the meaning of life?" mountain-top comic gag that was played out so often in the late Johnny Hart's comic strip BC.



It is the fourth book by Ajarn Sumano, and the subtitle "Simple lessons you can use from a Western Buddhist monk" accurately sums up its content.

Although Monk in the Mountain can be read by anyone, those familiar with the Buddhist concepts of karma, reincarnation and the inevitable suffering that results from attachment will get the most out

A read through a dispassionate primer such as What the Buddha Taught (Walpola Rahula, 1974, an extensive preview is available online at www.books. google.co.th/books) might be a better place to start for those who first want to gain an understanding of the the basic tenets of

The theme throughout Monk in the *Mountain* is gaining insight through meditation into the true nature of reality, or as Ajarn Sumano calls it, The Way Things Are. mat makes it an enjoyable read. The book's preface states, "The questions posed came from a wide spectrum of guests. Their ages ranged from 18 to 75 and their countries as diverse as Australia and Zimba-

Some of the questions border on typical "agony aunt" fodder. One man asks for advice about a relationship he is having with a bar girl who he is seriously considering getting married to, despite repeated warnings from friends.

"Almost every morning she offers food to the monks," he says in the woman's defense. "Apart from her occupation everything about her is appealing."

Ajarn Sumano first advises the man to take time to develop their friendship before rushing into marriage. Then he adds, "From a Buddhist perspective, I have to offer this for your reflection. The love you feel will certainly lead to suffering. Not because she has worked in a bar, but because of love. Romantic love, inevitably, is the catalyst for suffering. Your friends are right, but for the wrong rea-

Other questions are more metaphysical: "Is the soul in the mind or the body?"

Ajarn Sumano's reply: "Neither. The soul is neither in the body or the mind. It isn't anywhere because it doesn't exist. It exists only as a concept in our mind to try and secure continuity, to try and establish

The simple question-and-answer for- ourselves as an enduring entity. In reality, there isn't anything of substance anywhere at all. The concept of soul arises out of hope and confusion.

"It disappears once we investigate and find nothing of substance of in a sea of ever-changing phenomena arising and passing away. When we see the situation with clarity and wisdom, the fear factor that generates the concept of soul is displaced with awareness of the insubstantiality of everything. Then, a new distinct kind of security arises that cannot be described; it can only be known. With this security comes the assurance that all is well and that our inability and incapacity to be the owner of anything whatsoever is quite all right.'

Other topics he addresses include learning to develop and trust one's intuition, how to integrate meditation practice into modern life, sexual problems, worries about children and loved ones and how to deal with death, disillusionment, depression, despair and heartbreak – all from a strictly Buddhist viewpoint.

Monk on the Mountain will probably not appeal to those with fixed, non-Buddhist religious beliefs. For those interested in Buddhism and the freedom that is said to be obtainable by doing away with one's sense of "self", however, this book is a must read.

Are capital letters for the birds?

biologist sent a document for Aus to post to our stateagency website. He used capital letters to start every word of the names of seagulls, including the word "gull".

I told him that common names for animals should not be capitalized unless there are words in the name that are proper names normally. He argued that all common names for birds are capitalized per scientific standards. The editors in our agency do not agree. What is your opinion?

Barbara replies: If your biologist were publishing something in the journal of the American Ornithologists' Union, *The Auk*, his capitalized bird names would be appropriate. The instructions for

elcome to Word Court, where Barbara Wallraff unravels some of the mystery that shrouds the English language, debunking confusing usage and clearing away the clutter that prevents clear understanding – all by answering reader's questions.

aspiring authors of *Auk* articles are clear: "English names of birds should be capitalized."

But professional ornithologists don't edit your website – you and your co-workers do. You're right to apply mainstream standards to what appears on it, assuming the site is intended for the public. You're right, too, about what mainstream standards are as they relate to bird names. Correct examples are "California gull", "Franklin's gull", "herring gull", "laughing gull".

Specialists like your biologist

often make the mistake of thinking that the standards that they use when speaking or writing for other specialists are somehow better than the ones in common usage. They're not; they're just different. And while they make the language look more familiar to the specialists, they can make it look weird to everyone else. Stick to your gulls – I mean guns.

Te have a dispute at work about the use of plural or singular in the sentence "No residual high-grade dysplasia and no infiltrative pattern are evident." One person claims it should be singular "is" rather than "are". Which is correct?

Barbara replies: As a nonspecialist in whatever the heck specialty that jargon belongs to (medicine, surely?), I have trouble wrapping my mind around the exact words you used. So let's experiment with grammatically equivalent ordinary words: "No person and no dog were present." Um, no – that's no good. Because the words "person" and

"dog" are being negated, they don't count toward a plural total, as they would if the sentence read: "One person and one dog were there."

If the negated words were plural, that would be different: "No people and no dogs were there." But "dysplasia" and "pattern" are singular, so the singular verb "is" would be correct.

Do we really know about personal security?

While initially startling, the results of the Composite Human Security Index Study for 2006 (CHSI/2006) should come as little surprise to *Gazette* readers familiar with Phuket's longstanding "hidden population" problem [See "Inside Story", pp 4-5].

The nationwide study, the first of its kind conducted by the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security (MSO), was ordered for planning purposes by the government of former Prime Minister Surayud Chulanond. This was laudable, given that statistical analysis can be a powerful tool.

One of the more interesting results of the CHSI/2006 study – one you will never see mentioned by Tourism Authority of Thailand officials during their road shows abroad – is that Phuket came in dead last among Thailand's 76 provinces in the index for "personal security".

To most people, the term "personal security" will conjure up a wide range of issues: Is it safe for me to walk alone at night? What is my risk of falling victim to a terrorist attack? A drunk driver? A rabid dog? The avian flu virus or some other dangerous pathogen? What about disasters, natural and man-made? The list goes on, limited only by our capacity to engage in creative worry.

Unfortunately, the criteria used by the MSO researchers in establishing the CHSI/2006 index for personal security is too narrow, depending, as it does, solely on crime statistics tabulated by the police, whose purposes have more to do with pleasing superior officers than providing clean data for social scientists to analyze.

The extent to which the personal security indices are skewed by their over-reliance on police-provided data is indicated by the fact that only one of the three Southern border provinces at the center of the Muslim insurgency – Yala – fell in the bottom 10 nationwide.

Could it be that police who find themselves assigned there are more concerned with their own personal security issues than compiling impressive arrest records?

The CHSI/2006 study is only the first in what the MSO says will be a yearly exercise. The fact that they were not released until well into 2008 says as much about the current state of bureaucratic efficiency in Thailand as it does about the personal security issues facing the typical resident of Phuket.

More optimistically, perhaps the government will use the results to justify giving tourism provinces like Phuket and Chonburi the law-enforcement resources they need to better protect their millions of annual visitors.



Patong flight closure not an issue, says GM

egarding the order, there is really no reaction from Destination Air, as we were closing out the season anyway. The monsoon winds have changed and we had already made arrangements two weeks ago to move our pontoons because the wind is blowing out of the west now. The governor and everyone were well aware that we were moving everything out of there for the season – it is a seasonal

It changes absolutely nothing in terms of our scheduling because April 7 was to be our last day for the season. We can't go in there now; weather conditions don't allow it.

This is a short-term thing. They have asked us to create a couple of studies and we are working closely with the Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) and the environmental people already, as we have been for the past three or four months.


The DCA is satisfied that Destination Air was landing and flying in the authorized areas, not outside them. Some people came in and secretly made some videos of our takeoffs and landings and those confirmed to the DCA that we were operating where we were entitled to be. As far as the pollution and the noise, they also did some checks there and determined that the levels were acceptable.

Destination Air sees no rea-

ollowing complaints by several hotels, Governor Niran Kalayanamit on April 3 ordered the nonscheduled seaplane carrier Destination Air to suspend its service into Patong Bay.

Here, Destination Air General Manager Pat James explains that the airline had already planned to suspend services to Patong at the start of April due to the arrival of the southwest monsoon winds, and that it will be flying into the bay once again at the start of the next high season - with a few procedural changes in place.



son for not resuming operations in Patong Bay once the weather changes back to the northeasterly winds. What we will do, however, is set up differently. We will not come into the [Star Cruise] pier area. We'll transfer people by boat from a pontoon as we do at all of our 36 other authorized locations.

Over lunch and dinner meetings with the DCA, we discussed everything in detail. They requested that we file a new IEE request for the environment and request a different procedure in terms of how we process the passengers there. Both of those are not a problem; they are things we do everywhere else anyway, such as the boat pontoons for the

So we didn't see anything to the contrary or to the negative that was not already anticipated in our scheduling and our actions in terms of changing our services to the customers.

We discussed advertising scheduled flights with the DCA and they have asked us to move ahead and begin the process to become a scheduled carrier, just like the Bangkok-based carrier SGA did after years of being a non-scheduled carrier.

So we'll start the procedure to become a scheduled carrier. Between now and then, we simply will not post a "schedule" per se. We will have morning and afternoon flights available, but we will not market ourselves as a scheduled airline.

The announcement was somewhat anticlimactic as far as we are concerned, because there was nothing that resulted from the meeting that wasn't already preplanned many months ago. The outcome of the meeting did not

surprise anyone; it was anticipated.

The service that Destination Air offers to the community and to the tourism industry is tremendous for the high-end customers, the four- and five-star customers that the governor wants to attract to the area. So this is just a way of, how you would say, "pleasing" those who feel offended by the services - finding a better way of pleasing them.

We have never tried to be confrontational with anyone in any sense – nor will we ever be. We offer a specialized service to a very limited market. Destination Air works together with the DCA, the Ministry of Transport and the governor - we meet the governor quite regularly – to ensure that harmony is maintained.

The DCA director-general asked me to go ahead and curtail the service as we had planned to anyway and if we could do it two days earlier. So we said "sure".

So if you ask if this affects Destination Air in any way, it does only in the sense that we have a little more work to do over the monsoon season to reinstate ourselves as a more "communityfriendly" commodity to the area.

As far as our customers are concerned, the main difference will be that instead of being able to walk on and off in a more convenient manner, now we will simply be doing it from a bit further

Mr A was then able to use the court-case documents to seek enforcement of the court agreement. Having those documents saved Mr A a lot of time, as the case did not have to go back to court because no witnesses needed to be called to testify. Because the court's earlier decision was in favor of Mr A's claim, Mr A was able to request the freezing of his friend's assets.

Although Mr A's claim was supported by the court, he still faced the difficult task of finding out exactly what and where his friend's assets were before any action could be taken to freeze them


With an intimate knowledge of his friend's business, Mr A knew that his friend owned a piece of land. Mr A was able to force his friend to sell the land through a public auction, enabling Mr A to recoup about one third of the total amount owed to him.

For the remainder of the outstanding loan, Mr A requested that additional assets of his friend, such as company shares, be frozen and sold through public auc-

This particular case was concluded quickly compared with the time it would have taken for Mr A to go through more court appearances to hear witness testimonies, plus the possibility of having to appeal the court's initial verdict.

This case demonstrates that disputes over loans can be settled quickly if there is sufficient documentation as evidence.

One should never lend a substantial amount of money without a proper agreement secured with a property that can be easily disposed of through public

n last week's column I covered a large portion of a flurry of more than 40 announcements in March by Thai government agencies on high-technology projects planned for the next five years. Here, I will attempt to complete the big picture.

For a start, four mini-Silicon Valleys are in the works. The grandest is the World Paradise of Information and Communications Technology (ICT) R&D project to be situated on 4,000 rai in the "foothills surrounding Phuket".

Working with local authorities, TOT, CAT and the private sector, Paradise will provide incentives to foreign software firms, such as an eight-year, corporatetax break, business leads through the Software Industry Promotion Agency (SIPA) and help with visas and work permits. The goal is to attract about 20 software companies within six years.

After starting IT development in Thailand by introducing computers and the Internet to the Thai masses a decade ago, the National Electronics and Computer Technology Center (Nectec) has a 10-year plan to further aid the isolated province of Mae Hong Son near the Myanmar border by building a new IT center called IT Valley.

The main purpose of the center would be to serve devel-

opers and local people. The goals of the center are to receive sourcing contracts and be a hub of "opensource software or something re-

lated to animation".

Meanwhile, the Science and Technology Ministry, the Interior Ministry and the Industry Ministry are planning to set up Science City in Pathum Thani province. Envisioned as a hightech industry park, it will serve as a center of information, science and technology with a goal of facilitating foreign investment by improving competitiveness in Thai ICT by raising it to overseas standards.

Finally, Software Park Thailand is working with East Software Park, a Chinese software park operator in Hangzhou, to develop the software park business in Thailand by finding local partners for a new venture.

A potential benefit is to atforeign investors who may see the potential of Thailand as a springboard to further penetrate markets in other countries in the



More plans for a high-tech haven

Each of these new IT centers needs more infrastructure and there is no shortage of announcements for higher Internet bandwidth for Thailand.

Mun Patanotai, the new ICT minister, aims to establish a nationwide, third-generation wireless broadband network within one year. He hopes that TOT and CAT will invite the three main cellular operators - Advanced Info Service, DTAC and True Move – to form a joint project to establish an operational High-Speed Downlink Packet Access (HSDPA) system within a year.

HSDPA can be quickly deployed by upgrading GSM infrastructure, a technology used by all three main mobile operators in Thailand, and does not need new licenses from the National Telecommunications Commission (NCT) to be set up.

According to the president of the Association of Thai ICT Industry (ATCI), the NTC has steadfastly refused to grant public use of the 5GHz frequency

> range for Wi-Fi networking, putting Thailand in the company of Bangladesh, Tanzania and Zimbabwe as countries yet to do so. Using the 5GHz frequency

would provide more wireless connection channels, each with a higher throughput capability.

If Minister Mun can get TOT, CAT, AIS, DTAC and True Move to work together to improve the nation's Internet infrastructure, he has my write-in vote for a Nobel Prize.

Closer to home, a tremendous amount of action will be required to make Phuket folk forget what has gone down in the history books as the December 15 Internet Meltdown.

TOT is planning to invest 380 million baht to lay fiber-optic cable around Phuket as part of a fiber-to-home network that would provide high-speed bandwidth

capacity of 30Mbps to "high-end customers, businesses and foreigners who live in Phuket". TOT did not elaborate on the definition of "high-end".

These improved Internet speeds are purported to be a catalyst for new e-services and egovernment – and there is no shortage of announcements in these areas.

The ICT committee of Parliament has been drafting the "Thailand E-Government Strategic Plan Framework" for the development of electronic government services over the next three

A study by the Government Information Technology Services department revealed that about 800 government websites from more than 200 government organizations provide information and services, but attract only a small number of visitors.

The fourth and final step of the plan is to integrate government services into a single portal that will offer 500 electronic services rather than the 100 that are currently available.

SIPA in Phuket is developing the Phuket One-Stop Service

to allow people to access government and private-sector services from the Internet.

The first category, E-services, will allow the Phuket Immigration Office and the Phuket Employment Office to exchange information with the private sector, such as companies, hotels and hospitality services, that will provide tourist information and help people locate jobs.

The second category, data services, will enable entities such as the education office to access information on students. The Phuket Provincial Public Health Office will keep a database of patients in order to monitor the status of the public's health.

Before the end of this year, the ICT Ministry will set up a new agency, the Electronic Transaction Agency, to oversee the development of electronic commerce and electronic transac-

The new organization will undertake policy development and lay down infrastructure, including standards and legislation for the government and business sectors.

Initial projects include setting security standards, the establishment of a root-certification authority and the development of a legal framework.

So what success is projected for these ambitious projects? The Association of Thai Software Industry (ATSI) is aiming to increase Thai software companies' market share of software used in Thailand to 50% by the end of next year.

The supply side of the strategy is to work with government organizations responsible for software industry development, including SIPA, Nectec and Software Park Thailand.

The demand side of the strategy is to partner with associations representing those who use software, such as the Federation of Thai Industries and the Thai Chamber of Commerce, to encourage their members to use Thai software.

ATSI will also be promoting Thai software for export by working with SIPA to set up software outlets in other countries.

ccording to US Banking Group Morgan Stanley, the current world-banking crisis is the worst in 30 years, and has sparked a trend among investors of "short-selling" shares.

Short-selling means borrowing shares of a certain stock from a long-term holder, such as a pension fund, and selling them with the aim of buying the shares back at a lower price in the future. The shares are then replaced and a profit is made on the difference – less an interest charge from the long-term holder.

The US investment bank Lehman Brothers recently found itself marked as a favorite target for short sellers, so the bank defended itself with a capital-raising exercise to the tune of US\$3 billion (more than 90 billion baht). The market was in fact prepared to invest US\$4 billion in Lehman Brothers. This show of confidence in the Lehman Brothers was sufficient to cause many short-sellers to quickly repurchase Lehman shares as their value rose sharply.

Other examples of underlying confidence, despite the global banking crisis, include a "bear raid" in late March on shares of the UK's largest mortgage lender, the Halifax Bank of Scotland (HBOS). In just one morning, market rumors about the finan-

The ensuing panic forced Britain's central bank, the Bank of England, to take the highly unusual step of publicly backing the bank and attesting to its financial strength, enabling HBOS to quickly recover most of its losses, although an official investigation has been launched to name the parties involved in sparking the

It is quite legal in most markets to "short" a stock, or, in other words, to profit from a falling share price. It is most definitely illegal, however, to start false and malicious rumors in order to create panic among investors. Naturally, these cases are difficult to solve, as short-sellers will simply claim that they viewed a company in a negative light and had been swayed by "rumors".

In some cases regulators can prove foul play by showing

cial health of HBOS led to an that certain parties made huge profits in a short period. Shortsellers actually add to the depth of a market and are generally viewed as welcome participants. Insider trading, however, remains illegal.

> Yet another case of a large bank being forced to raise more capital to remain solvent was highlighted in an announcement by Switzerland's largest bank, the UBS, of more losses in US mortgage-related business. The announcement was made almost simultaneously with the Lehman Brothers fiasco.

UBS Losses have amounted to more than US\$38 billion since the final quarter of 2007. Its chairman Marcel Ospel resigned and a group of activist shareholders are threatening legal action against the bank if it does not exit the US market. UBS share prices fell by about 50% at the beginning of the credit crunch.

When UBS announced the departure of its chairman, share values began increasing and a broader market rally in financial stocks was also apparent. Naturally, this is not the image UBS wishes to present to the world.

The UK also saw a rally on financial stocks but the banking

system is still "frozen" at unpleasant levels, making mortgages and other forms of credit harder for people to obtain, especially potential borrowers with poor credit histories and first-time house buyers.

The freeze has resulted in a nationwide dip in housing prices over the past

five months, according to a survey conducted by the UK's second largest housing lender, Nationwide.

However, the results of a survey published by Bloomberg show that residential property at the "top end" (London) is still growing in value, albeit at the slowest pace in four months.

Credit supply is vital to a county's economic growth. The slowdown in availability is causing much concern in the UK, where economists predict that economic growth in 2008 and 2009 – though not necessarily halting completely – will still be slow enough to feel recessionary.

Here's another example of how quickly a company and the names of those at its helm can be tarnished when things don't go so well. If, sometime before March 27, you had you asked members of the wider British public to name the CEO of British Airways, very few people could have responded correctly. 48 hours after that date, more than half of those questioned would be able to answer "Willie

Willie Walsh was recently in the spotlight when British Airways and airport operator BAA opened a fifth terminal at Heathrow Airport. Aptly labeled "T5", the new terminal was an instant disaster. Bad planning and inadequate testing before the terminal's launch caused the entire airport's baggage system to fail.

Baggage handlers claimed

that British Airways were so out of touch and behind with the preparations that airport workers arriving at the new terminal on the opening day found the staff car park locked.


Willie Walsh admitted to the media that this was not British Airways' finest hour. Although

he said he would take full responsibility for the carnage, he did say "no" when asked if he would resign from his position. Perhaps the outgoing chairmen of UBS, Citigroup, Merrill Lynch, et al, should also have tried that line.

Bloomberg reports that some 20,000 bags are somewhere on an eleven-mile baggage conveyor system under T5 – two of them belong to me. As a result, BA's lost property system appears to have collapsed under the strain. It just goes to show how quickly a respected brand name can be tarnished.

PHUKET: Citing a lack of demand, Jetstar Asia Airways has ditched its service between Phuket and Singapore, while Tiger Airways has halved its service of the same route.

Only 18 months after introducing a Phuket-Singapore air link, Singapore-based Jetstar Asia announced on March 30 that it has suspended its service of six flights a week. Low demand and a reallocation of resources were revealed as the reasons behind the sudden cancellation.

Times reported on March 27 that Tiger Airways has reduced its Singapore-Phuket service from twice daily to once daily, while at the same time beefing up its routes to Vietnam and India.

"Inconsistent demand" was cited in the Straits Times report as being the primary reason for cutting back on the Phuket service.

Jetstar Asia, together with its sister airline Valuair, also shifted its focus to other markets, particularly Indonesia.

Following Jetstar Asia's announcement, Thai AirAsia was quick to issue a statement that it was "confident its load factor on the Phuket-Singapore route will reach over 80% in the next three to four months."

Since opening the route in November last year Thai Air-Asia's seat occupancy has risen from more than 60% to more than

Tassapon Bijleveld, Thai AirAsia CEO, said, "We are strongly confident in the Phuket-Singapore tourism market and expect it to grow stronger.

"A tremendous increase in traffic should come with the airline's aggressive marketing of the route and Tourism Authority of Thailand's support. Already, the route is getting more attention from travelers from Singapore and Phuket.'

SilkAir recently trimmed its

resume the 32-flight schedule in October. Many of its seats are filled with transit passengers from parent company Singapore Airlines' long-haul flights.

SilkAir's Phuket branch manager, Hansoo Tan, told the Gazette, "We are enjoying healthy loads and Phuket remains one of our top-performing destinations.

"Outbound sales have shown growth in spite of the excess capacity on the route and as competitors pull out, we expect this trend to continue with more industry support."

Regarding the outlook for travel between Singapore and Phuket, Mr Tan said, "We have no crystal ball here, but we always have to be prepared for the fact that leisure markets are elastic and are easily impacted by world developments and natural

"What makes Phuket spe-

cial is it that it has shown itself to be an incredibly resilient destination. It is a quality product, easy to package and very accessible," he said.


"Also, as Asia is growing increasingly affluent, we expect more interregional travel, which Phuket will benefit from," he said.

"We're not just looking to grow point-to-point traffic, but are constantly leveraging on the combined Singapore Airlines-SilkAir network of more than 90 destinations," he added.





Chalong night bazaar underway

CHALONG: When complete, the available for rent have already two-story Golden Dragon Plaza currently under construction near Chalong Circle will cover 800 square meters and make available 25 units for rental.

Each of the high-ceilinged units, which are designed to serve as beer bars, are 13 square meters in area.

The entire complex is triangular shaped and occupies half a rai, with communal mens' and women's bathroms at the rear.

Sun Land Hill Co Ltd are carrying out the construction of the plaza at a cost of about 12 million baht.

About 20% of the construction has been completed since building began at the beginning of April. Expected to be fully operational by mid-May, the plaza will include an area dedicated to stalls for what its developer expects to become a popular "night bazaar".

"This plaza will offer another meeting point for people in the Chalong area," said Na-phet "Tony" Phetklang, General Manager of Sun Land Hills Co Ltd.

Some 60% of the shop units







Ringing in a Balinese belle


Ithough "contemporary Balinese style" is all the buzz in Phuket property, Antonie "Tony" Polfliet of The Bell in Kamala says that it is the special finishing touches incorporated into the project that makes the private enclave of 17 villas unique.

"The style and the concept is mostly contemporary Balinese. We have a black-tiled pool in the middle and everything is built in an L shape around it. But inside, the furniture is more like contemporary Chinese. This gives the homes a modern Asian-Chinese look. It's very special; not many projects have something like this,"

"The design creates an 'open' feeling and we have tried to create a lot of open space outside with a large terrace where people can wine and dine. Also, large sliding doors that open up from the living and dining rooms and from the master bedroom.

"All the furniture and decor was designed by our in-house artist, so it's all pretty much custom made," Mr Polfliet added.

"A lot of projects have nice furniture, but the furniture doesn't work well with the home. We needed to have one source who had good taste and who could make good decisions so that everything would work perfectly together – that's the most important thing for interior design," he



Mr Polfliet explained that a close relationship between the project owner and the architects, Phuket-based Roof Company, allowed for flexibility in settling on the final plans. "We wanted to create something romantic. When you walk in, the impression has to be stunning and the home has to have a romantic Asian feeling. That's the most important aspect of our project. We tried to create that, and we

also looked for influences from elsewhere." he said.

"The design took at least two years to finalise, and it was about three years before we started building. There were very few changes in the design. We had a very good idea of what we wanted before we started working with the architects and the ideas worked very well with the interior design artist as well," he

Phuket are named after their most prominent features, The Bell took a different course. "We wanted to create a theme for the project. Throughout the entire development, including the reception and in the villas themselves, you will see bell shapes, such as the light fittings in the living and dining rooms and the lampshades in the master bedroom," Mr Polfliet said.

"It's also a very easy name Although most projects on to remember," he laughed.

The color scheme of cream with black trim, including the black-tiled, infinity-edge pools and the black powder coated aluminum sliding door frames, has received positive feedback, he

"The black and white creates a classic look which will still look nice in 10 years. It's classy and works very well with the wood used throughout the project. We used cedar for roof shingles and teak for the doors, all of the highest quality," he added.

"The wood creates a warm feeling. Homes with normal roof tiles don't create the same feeling as the wooden roof tiles we have used, which do not look so tough or hard," he added.

ermans. You've got to love them. Well some body has to. It's occurred to me that there are one or two *Gazette* readers who may happen to be from that particular country, so I should choose my words carefully.

Or perhaps not. Their legendary sense of humor is world renowned and they probably have their own interpretation of the word "humor". I'm sure they would have found the T-shirt that I bought from Tesco-Lotus during the world cup hilarious – a large black, red and yellow flag with the word "GREMANY" emblazoned below.

They certainly know how to have fun. Each year in December the Gesellschaft für Deutsche Sprache (GfdS), the German Language Society, announces its selection of the top-ranked words of the year. Last year it was *klimakatastrophe*, a term arising out of the growing concern over climate change in Germany and the world.

German words are too long. I did a quick search online and it would appear that there isn't a "longest word" in German. This can get even more confusing than their rather curious Obsession with capital Letters for Nouns.

Germanating the world

Flower names can be equally confusing. The cream-fruit plant, or Indian rubber vine, has two names in Latin: *strophanthus gratus* and *roupellia grata*. I've asked several Thai friends and they struggle to provide a definitive name for the plant in Thai.

So far, we've come up with daeg peenang, yaem peenang and nang yeng peenang. The only thing all three have in common is a reference to the Malaysian island somewhere in the dim and distant history of the plant. Take your pick.

Originally from tropical West Africa, the cream-fruit plant was brought to this part of the world by early explorers. Its glossy evergreen leaves are thick and leathery, and it bears clusters of waxy, bell-shaped, purple and white flowers that look a bit like begonias but are fragrant at night.

Its distinctive scent kind of reminds me of the rather inexpensive perfume sported by early girlfriends, way back in my teens. Not exactly Chanel No 5, but fragrant enough.

The flowers that bloom from the initial deep-purple buds

are a decidedly weird shape. Five petals surround an inchdeep hole in the center of the flower, with a long pollen-covered stamen in the middle. The open central

part is surrounded by a dozen or so vertical spikes, in contrast to the delicate petals around them. Even after they're cut, these flowers last several days, making them an excellent choice for floral displays.

The folk healers of West Africa have found a number of uses for the cream-fruit plant. They make a rubbing compound from its leaves to reduce fevers;



they mash the leaves to treat various skin problems and wounds and they make certain medical remedies from the leaves to treat more "unmentionable" problems.

A substance known as ouabain can be obtained from the seed of the *strophanthus*. The most common use in its native land was as a source of arrow poison, used both for hunting and for forays with their neighbors.

It was this use that initially brought the plant to the attention of Western science back in 1861, when explorer David Livingstone observed natives hunting with a poison that had been made from the seed of a closely related plant (a vine called *strophanthus kombe*).

He later reported the substance as an apparent cardiac stimulant, which led to the investigation of many similar species, of which *strophanthus gratus* turned out to be the most valuable.

Africans who later heard

that the English were using the poison from the seeds as a medicine concluded that the English were a completely mad race. Still true to this day, of course.

As it belongs in the allamanda family, the internal sap of the plant is poisonous. Just before I sat down to write this, I picked a cream-fruit flower from my garden (the one in the picture) and it seemed quite keen to secrete as much sap on my skin as it could.

If you do handle this plant, make sure that you wear gloves or at least avoid touching that sap.


Strophanthus gratus grows like crazy, given the right conditions. The one in my garden started life as a tiny pot plant, but once it became established in a shady corner, it went completely bonkers, making its way into the eaves of the house, showing no signs of slowing down.

This plant adores the sun. It is content in the shade, but the more sunlight it gets, the more flowers it produces. More flowers also appear when it's drier, so it shouldn't be over-watered.

To propagate the creamfruit plant, all you need is snip off a fairly woody cutting and stick it in some moist compost. It will take root and grow fairly quickly.

The cream-fruit plant is a delightful smelly plant that looks good too. What's it really called though? Germans, Africans and everyone else should just be careful if they use it to treat their "unmentionable" problems. Now there's an invitation for a German joke punchline, if ever there was one.
