New international school set to open

THALANG: Phuket International Academy (PIA), under construction on Soi Teenped-Nanai, next to Khao Pra Taew National Park, is scheduled to open on September 8 with its first students ranging from nursery through to Grade 4 taking classes.

The school, once complete, will also feature primary, junior and senior high schools and a modern sports and performing arts facility. All construction is scheduled to be complete by September 2009.

The academy's director, Iranian clinical psychologist Mohammed Ali Khakpoor, said, "Phuket International Academy provides an experience-centered, rigorous and well-rounded education for a diverse commu-

"Recognizing that students have a variety of needs at each developmental stage and learn in different ways, the school is committed to help each student learn well and developing to be a citizen of the world."

Elaborating on the curriculum to be used, the school's website states, "We believe that academic success leads to career success and that many kids can get there. But we also recognize that there is more than one way of learning – that not all kids learn in the same way.

"Our award-winning curriculum brings lessons to life with a rich mixture of on- and offline teaching tools, including interactive animations, printed books with beautiful illustrations and narratives, original CDs and videos, and hands-on materials for experiments.



Phase I of the school starts taking shape at the site in Thalang, with the first students expected to start classes on September 8.

"Lessons are followed by assessments so you can be sure that your child has mastered a particular area before moving on. Built-in planning and progress tools make it easy to keep on

"Each lesson is created by a team of experts, using triedand-true educational approaches and the patented methodology for online instruction."

The school, located on about 125 rai, aims to have more than 700 students in attendance.

The school's philosophy shows how they realize that students learn in different ways at different developmental stages. PIA is committed to helping its students develop critical thinking, creativity, emotional and physical

well-being.

Students will have a strong sense of both personal and social responsibility and once completing their studies they will have developed into grounded individuals with a life-long passion for learning.

The school is now accepting enrollment at their Phuket Boat Lagoon Marina office.

At the time of going to press, Mr Knakpoor was unavailable to elaborate further on details about the school, such as teachers' qualifications, entrance fees and specific study units in the curriculum.

However, he said he would be available soon to explain exclusively to the *Gazette* all such further aspects of the school.

Campaign to reduce plastic waste launched

PHUKET CITY: In possibly Phuket's first unilateral move to reduce the volume of trash created each day on the island, the leaders of all 19 local administration organizations on Phuket as well as representatives of 23 businesses, shops, department stores and resorts on the island - signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) at The Metropole Hotel on July 9.

The MOU aims to have the signatories actively take part in efforts to reduce the amount of plastic waste on the island, such as used plastic shopping bags and items containing plastic used by

Leading the signing ceremony was Pireeyutma Vanapruk, president of the Development of Environment and Energy Foundation (DEE).

Also signing the MOU were Phuket Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima, Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) President Paiboon Upatising, Deputy Chief of Patong Municipality Supat Ratanasmahan and Prad Tinnasulanont from CP All Co, the Phuket representative of 7-Eleven stores.

Khun Pireeyutma explained, "This campaign will include assistance from Patong hotels and department stores in Karon and Cherng Talay, while 7-Eleven customers will be asked first if they want a bag for their groceries," he said.

"Kata Thani Phuket Beach Resort Hotel has been appointed as a representative of hotels in Phuket as the resort already has a good waste-management system to reduce many kinds of waste, including plastic bags."





One-Two-Go slapped with 30-day suspension

BANGKOK (Nation): One-Two-Go and Orient Thai Airlines risk seeing their aviation licenses revoked if they fail to tackle the defects that led to the suspension of their flight services on July 22.

That possibility comes amid growing concerns about the airlines' safety standards.

About 40,000 passengers on their booking lists will be affected by the 30-day flight suspension starting July 22 and will receive combined compensation of 70 million baht. They can also opt to be transferred to other airlines operating on the affected routes.

"Orient Thai and One-Two-Go are the second group to face service suspension after Sky Aviation," Civil Aviation Department Director-General Chaisak Angkasuwan told a press conference on July 21.

"All defects must be solved within 30 days. In case of negligence or incomplete action, the department can further suspend

They operate with eight MD-80 Series and seven Boeing 474s. All eight MD-80 Series aircraft must be grounded until all defects are corrected; the Boeing 474s can continue opera-

The department will also suspend the licenses of One-Two-Go's seven pilots - six Indonesians and one Venezuelan due to false documentation. Two Thai pilots have also been suspended for 30 days on a similar

The Civil Aviation Department said One-Two-Go's defects lie in a general lack of quality assurance. The aircraft lessee, Orient Thai, has been allowed to breach safety standards, particularly on scheduling and administration. Orient Thai also has no staff of its own and is assisted by One-Two-Go staff.

One-Two-Go's safety standards first came into focus when one of its planes crashed in Phuket last year. Lawyers for the British and US families of the 90 victims are seeking UK£125 million (8.32 billion baht) in compensation in US courts in a case that may shed a harsh light on the cost-cutting and safety standards of some budget airlines.

Rough seas sink trawler off Racha

KOH RACHA YAI: Crew on board the Sang Samut scrambled on top of the upturned hull of their trawler on the morning of July 17 as their 40-foot fishing boat gradually sank in rough seas off Koh Racha Yai.

Sopon Sukkarin, vicechairman of Koh Racha Yai Conservation and Prevention Network Club, told the Gazette, "The boat started taking on water the night before, when there were torrential downpours and

"The 10 crewmen had already called another boat for help and to be towed to shore."

"They were towed to the east side of the island, but the boat started to slowly sink about 9 am. The crew finally abandoned ship and boarded the fishing boat that had towed them,"

Khun Sopon said that the Marine Police and the Third Naval Area Command had been notified. "They have contacted the owner of Sang Samut and arranged to try to refloat her when the heavy conditions subside," he

"The boat is valued at about 3 million baht and she is now sunk just 150 meters from the eastern coast of the island," K. Sopon

Vice Chairman of Koh Racha Yai conservation and prevention network club, Sopon Sukkarin, told the *Gazette* that the Sang Samut was refloated and towed to the fishing port at Koh Sireh on July 19.

OrBorJor to offer incentives for hotel rooms tax payment

PHUKET: In a move to encourage Phuket hotels to pay their dues, Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBor-Jor) President Paiboon Upatising has said that the OrBorJor will start offering incentives to hotels that pay the controversial rooms

Although he did not specifically explain what incentives would be offered, Khun Paiboon said that they would be in the form of personnel or human resources development so that businesses that complied with the tax would be able to enhance skills of their employees.

Khun Paiboon said that Phuket OrBorJor aims to collect at least 80 million baht in accommodation tax this year.

To this end, he has invited hoteliers, the Phuket Tourist Association and other local hotels' clubs to discuss co-operation.

He added that some hotels have not paid any rooms tax despite the tax being introduced eight years ago – as they do not understand how the revenue generated would be spent.

General gets bird's-eye look at land shenanigans

KARON: Maj Gen Intarat Yodbangtoey, "special adviser" to Natural Resources and Environment Minister Anongwan Thepsutin, wrapped up his two-day visit to Phuket on July 17 with a helicopter inspection tour of suspected illegally acquired land plots on Phuket.

"About 20 construction sites believed to be illegal are under investigation by the DSI [Department of Special Investigations]. We expect the DSI to announce the results of their investigations soon," Gen Intarat said.

After his aerial tour, Gen Intarat said he had noticed there were many construction sites on Forestry Department land in the hills at Tri Trang, Patong and Kamala.

Following his meeting with Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit to discuss the role of Phuket provincial government officers in preventing encroachment on Forestry Department land, Gen Intarat said, "We may investigate local administration organizations, too. We have selected special officers to investigate encroachment cases, with the team headed by Monthon "Palad Rambo" Chartsuwan.

"We are inspecting plots with deeds that were approved in 2002 by a former Land Department officer," Gen Intarat said, referring to Thawatchai Anukul, a former registrar of the Phuket Provincial Land Office.

In 2003, the Criminal Court in Bangkok issued arrest warrants for Thawatchai and fellow Land Office official Uru Thipthep of the Kathu District Land Of-

Uru was arrested that same

year, though Thawatchai avoided capture and has been a fugitive

"Approved deeds for land in Phuket were a particular problem in 2002 and 2003, when about 3,000 plots were approved," Gen Intarat said.

To guard against future illegal developments on the island, he said, "We plan to send the rules for approving deeds for land in Phuket to the DSI, embassies, the Land Office and the Royal

Thai Police and warn them to check Phuket deeds carefully before approving them.

He added that illegal projects on hillsides posed a danger to people's safety, particularly those in landslide risk areas. "Investors should know where exactly they are allowed to build, but there are many people who sell illegal land plots and this could be dangerous for people living in Phuket," he said.

"Influential persons" were often involved in such illegal dealings, he added.

Gen Intarat also said that he had received requests to change the ban on building 80 meters above sea level to 120m above sea level. "This will affect land prices and result in more construction sites [in the hills]," he

"I worry about more construction sites on hills because even a small earthquake could lead to serious damage," he added.

Phobpol Sirilaksanapong, chief of the Phuket Provincial Forestry Office, told the Gazette, "We found a total of about 1,000 rai in Patong and Kamala that has developments under construction. The sites look like resorts and hotel buildings. Of those that I have investigated, some of the project owners have presented title deeds for the land they occupy. I have yet to see the title deeds for the others.

"However, of about 600 rai that had been returned to the state because it was SorPorKor land, including land at Tri Trang and near the Laem Son beachfront in Kamala, some of it had been cleared as if ready for construction and other parts already had buildings on it," he said.

K. Phobpol added that his office was investigating possible encroachment on national forest

"We are currently investigating how the owners of the Capsule and Parisa projects were issued titles for some of the land their projects are on," he said.

Top police line up to investigate Kathu 'professional hit'

KATHU (Gazette, Kom Chad Luek): The mafia-style murder of Komkai Kositkoon, whose mother owns Jintana Shopping Plaza in Patong, has caught the attention of some of the nation's top police.

'Maj Gen Chatree Sunthornsorn, a personal assistant to the national police chief, was in Phuket yesterday and has taken over control of the case," Thung Thong Police Superintendent Col Arayapan Pukbuakao said on July 22.

Khun Komkai's body was riddled by nine bullets shortly after 7 pm on July 18, when she was attacked about 500 meters from Kathu District Office.

The attacked left seven bullet holes through the windshield, three through the front passenger window, four through the bonnet and two exit holes in the rear window.

Komkai Kositkoon died in the driver's

seat. Her husband, Khun Araya, 53, was torbike who drove past firing a 9mm autotaken to Bangkok Hospital Phuket with one bullet lodged in his left ribs and three bullets in his left arm.

Police recovered some 30 bullet casings from the scene.

"The investigation is now to be carried out by four teams: Thung Thong Police, Kathu Police, Region 8 investigators and the Central Investigation Department's Crime Suppression Division," Col Arayapan said.

Although local media reports stated that police had said the motive may be related to the fact that K. Komkai is a beneficiary in her mother's will, Tung Tong District Police Inspector Lt Col Kittipong Klai Kaew told the Gazette, "It is too early to jump to conclusions. I am not sure about the motive yet. Investigations so far have revealed only that the car was followed by two men on a mo-

matic pistol before speeding off towards Phuket City."

Lasers were used to calculate the angles of entry and exit of the bullets and metal detectors were used to scour the area to find the bullet cases that villagers had thrown from the road into the surrounding bush, he said.

Phuket Provincial Police Chief Gen Apirak Hongthong said, "Provincial police will now work alongside the local Kathu police.

"The style of execution and proficient use of war weapons shows us that the killers are professionals, and all known professional killers in Phuket will be investigated.

However, he added, "The strongest motive so far is probably a conflict within the management of Jintana Plaza. This is a highprofile case that closely resembles the Hang Tong Thamwattana murder in Bangkok."



he park is popular with Phuket's young and old, and it just so happens to be round the corner from the skateboarders' new clubhouse, called Ketto Child at 32 Thepkrasattri Rd opposite the Phuket Inn Hotel. Ketto Child is a double-play on words. Some of the skateboard gang said that Ketto is a cute term for Phuket kids abbreviated from "Phuketto", others said that it was local term meaning "ghetto".

The owner of the building where Ketto Child is located, Anon Thanomsak, explained that the word can mean either or both. Although he owns the building, Khun Anon was quick to clarify that there is no actual manager, and that the arrangement is more of a community co-operative with skateboarders running small businesses in the building, which used to house a photo shop.

Today, there is a quaint bar where the gang hangs out. It is decked out with strange memorabilia, ranging from vinyl records to highly imaginative cartoon art on the walls.

At the back of Ketto Child, there is a skateboard shop where skaters buy pieces for their boards or the parts to assemble their own boards. The shop also makes custom boards to order and also imports them. Upstairs is a tattoo parlor and a crash-pad.

Phuket's sidewalk

aphan Hin used to be the place to skateboard, but today there are holes in the park and the area has become a hangout for unsavory gangs where drink, drugs and voilence are common.

Today, Phuket's skateboarders perform their kickflips and ollies at Queen Sirikit Park on Thalang Rd, where they share the open spaces with other gangs of hobbyists.

The *Gazette*'s Chief Reporter **Akbar Khan** and **Puchit Sansok** hung out with the gang to report on the resurgence of skateboards to find out what these concrete surfers are all about.

Anon introduced us to the shop's cartoonist-cum-designer Amann Tanhemnayoo who also maintains a database of the island's skateboarders and helped realize a dream shared by all the skateboarders when Ketto Child opened four months ago.

Amann was born in the Southernmost tip of Thailand – Sungai Kolok, traditionally a party town in Narithiwat for Malaysians until the South flared up. Amann, the skateboarding gang's only Muslim, who came to Phuket nine years ago to study. He also worked in a skateboard shop in Ocean Mall that is now long gone.

More recently, the gang's first female member joined, although, apparently in the past,

Phuket has had a fair number of girl gliders.

The gang is a mixed bag of Thais and foreigners, who like their Thai counterparts, prove that looks can be deceiving. One trendy kid turned out to be quite a socially responsible intellectual for his age; 18-year-old "Dan" was born in South Africa, grew up in the UK and has now made Phuket his home, working as an English, Maths, Health and Science teacher in Wannasathit school's English-language program in Cherng Talay.

"Occasionally, teachers from the island's schools go to meet the skaters looking for volunteer English teachers, as these kids have great ability at communicating with the younger generation, grabbing their attention and inspiring them," said Dan.

Most of the Skateboard gang speak English, and Phuket police often ask them for help as interpreters when a tourist is in distress. This task does, however, often mean doing more than simple interpretation but the skateboarders are most willing to volunteer their services in return for the appreciation they earn from the local boys in brown.

For these youngsters, the word "respect" is adjectivally spot-on as the gang introduced the other "gangs" in the city park. They are all very civilized.

The other "gangs" chilling in the park that evening included the roller-skaters, the radio-controlled-car gang, which hangs out in the sheltered carpark lit up all night, and the "Thai Kek" gang. Thai Kek is like a fusion of martial arts and vogue, it looks like slow-motion kung fu.

The number of skateboarders in Phuket rises and falls continually. The group attributes this to the fact that unlike stamp collecting, it is not a life-long hobby. Nowadays, there are between 20 to 30 skateboarders at the park every evening and with a more organized community the numbers are rising.

"Ten years is about the most anyone keeps up skateboarding

for," said Amann, adding that once they get a serious job or a wife they usually move on to more mature hobbies.

One half-Thai half-Canadian lad, Clay Hemmerich, came down from Bangkok with his skateboard and was over-

come by the hospitality and friendship offered by the Ketto gang.

Jassada Salideesuk a 19year-old student at Achiwa Phuket was delighted when he spotted a new face with a skateboard in town and shouted out to Clay, "Follow me!"

Clay followed Jassada to Ketto Child and was told that he could crash at the club and make it his holiday home – which he did

Clay was thrilled to discover that Phuket does have a vibrant

skateboarding gang that land-surfs in the park almost every evening.

Jassada said that he first learned about skating from television when he was 12 years old and found it challenging. He has seen fellow skateboarders come and go, but now that there is a real club, he is glad to have companions to share his hobby with – so much so, that he spent his 4,800-baht savings on a top-notch board.

If you go down to the park in the evening but cannot see the

gang, then try going up the stairs to the elevated area above the carpark where they will probably be. Up there, there are even more walls and flights of stairs to be used as runways, the concrete equivalents of waves, so that they can fly

through the air on their boards.

Apart from the natural obstacles in the park, the gang have made some of their own, such as a green grind-box and a flat-bar which are just a foot or so off the ground so that they can simulate sliding down a stair railing without the risks of falling from a height when attempting to do it on the real thing.

Seeing these guys fall from their boards from time to time yet bouncing straight back up made us wonder how safe this hobby really is. Amann said, "At the side


of the park there is a sheer drop into a murky canal 12 feet below. One guy skated into the canal a long time ago, but luckily, he wasn't seriously injured."

Such a lavish park must have cost a pretty penny. Forgetting to put up a wall or railing is a worrying oversight.

Skateboarding is not everyone's cup of tea, but an enjoyable evening in the city park can be had by all. People-watching and chatting with the informative locals is fabulous free entertainment.

The drinks around the corner at Ketto Child are cheap and even alcoholic if you are old enough to drink.

You don't have to be a skateboarder to chill in their mellow environment. Being the nice guys that they are, all are welcome.

Mistreated monkey takes murderous measures

NAKHON PATHOM: Following last week's tragi-comic deaths through overreaction, this week is an example of another common theme in the Thai press: death through drunkenly taunting vicious animals.

Whether tigers, elephants or cobras – as in the case last month

when a man in Ayudhaya tried to bite a cobra to death with predictable results no animal species is too large or too fierce to be immune to drunken tail pulling or random prodding.

The latest case to emerge involved 51-year-old Panya Phongpraphan and his long-suffering pet,

Jao Jor, a crab-eating macaque.

Monkeys may not seem as fearsome as some of the other animals mentioned above, but as anyone who has seen a macaque open its mouth will tell you, they have fangs that would put an Alsatian to shame.

Panya's eldest son, Phuchet, 26, said that his father was an animal lover who kept many pets, including dogs, cats, squirrels, rabbits and his monkey, Jao Jor. At first, Jao Jor was tied up in front of the house, but as he has a fierce nature and had tried to attack local children, he was eventually moved round the back.

Panya was also a bit of a drinker. When he arrived home drunk, he would often take his

frustrations out on his monkey, beating him with a stick and kicking him, said Khun Phuchet.

Then, on July 12, Panya beat his monkey once too often and the primate struck back, savagely biting his mater's leg. Panya, still the worse for wear after a drinking session, managed to fight off

> his pet and crawl back into the house where he attempted to dress the wound, but passed out.

When K. Phuchet found his father, he was already dead.


An autopsy on revealed he had died from loss of blood after arteries in his leg were severed.

The following day, Panya's distraught wife, Phraeo Masuk, 47, contradicting her son, said that this was the first time Jao Jor had ever acted aggressively and speculating that perhaps the monkey was stressed. She added that she would give Jao Jor away before anyone else in the house was hurt.

Neighbors were less surprised by the event, saying that Panya had bought Jao Jor about three years ago with the intention of training him to collect coconuts.

Jao Jor, however, was not a very conscientious monkey and would not concentrate on his work, prompting Panya to beat him, neighbors said.

n eight-hour meeting between Thailand and Cambodia to solve the military stand off near Khao Phra Viharn temple failed to reach any breakthrough on July 21.

However, representatives from both countries said they will keep troops and weapons at the site and will try not to use force to resolve the issue.

Supreme Commander Gen Boonsang Niempradit and Cambodia's Deputy Prime Minister and Defense Minister Gen Tea Banh, who chaired the special meeting of the General Border Commission, emerged at a press conference after nearly eight hours of meeting at the Indochina Hotel in Aranyaprathet district in Sa Kaew Province, on the border with Cambodia.

The meeting was called as the military stand-off near the temple reached six days. Both countries deployed troops and weapons to the 4.6-square-kilometer site near the temple. Thais claimed that the area comprises overlapping zones, while Cambodians claimed it is Cambodian land.

Both Gen Boonsang and Gen Tea Banh cited legislation and legal technicalities as obstacles in reaching any agreement on the issue.

Gen Boonsang declined to answer when asked whether the meeting was a failure.

However, the generals said both troops will avoid using force in the area.

Sexual healing. A 44-year-old monk was arrested in Pattaya on July 16 for performing a charisma ceremony that required sexual intercourse as part of the ritual.

At about 3 am July 16, Col Noppadon Wongnom, superintendent of Pattaya Police Station, received a phone call informing him that a monk in a saffron robe had been at the Good View Resort motel with a woman.

Police arrived at the motel and gained entry to an unnumbered room with the help of a staff member.

In the room, police found a man in bed with a woman, while a saffron robe and women's clothes were piled on the edge of the bed.

Police ordered the amorous couple to dress before questioning them and allowing media to enter the room.

Police identified the man as Pradong Pukingploy, also known as Phra Prok Dong Tanvaro, from Wat Photisrithangam in Kalasin province.

Pradong confessed to arranging for Nonthaburi native Tanawan Parkutsa, a married saleswoman, to join him at the motel so he could perform a *Mettha Maha Niyom* ceremony with her.

Police recovered from the scene a Buddha image, incense sticks, candles and sacred strings.

Pradong told police that he had been performing a sacred rite to impart holy magic into Tannawan, which required him to

ejaculate into her womb.

Tanawan explained to police that she had fallen in love with a rich man, but was unable to create an amorous love-making mood and so sought the services of Pradong, whose ceremonial practices she believed would make her more alluring and erotic.

Police took Pradong to Wat Chai Mongkon to be defrocked.

Nine lives. A 30-year-old convenience store thief wanted for nine cases of robbery was arrested on July 19 after a high-speed chase through the streets of Bangkok.

Nanthawut Promjai's latest robbery occurred at a 7-Eleven on Phetchaburi Rd. Police set up a road block, but Nanthawut powered through it on his motorcycle, leading police to give chase on their own motorbikes.

Nanthawut, a repairman of fridges and air-conditioning units, was arrested after being forced off Sri Nakarin Rd near the Lum Salee intersection.

He confessed to nine accounts of robbery, citing a 10,000-baht debt incurred after a failed Jatukham Ramathep venture as his motivation for the thieving spree, police said.

He also told police that he supports his girlfriend, who is studying for a post-graduate degree, as well as his farming mother.

"I am pressured to pay these debts many times a day. I knew the police were looking for

Body found. After complaining about the smell of water in their apartments, which many of them used to cook rice, residents of Patcharin apartment in Soi Thai Thani, Bangkok, received a nasty shock when the body of a young girl was found rotting inside the apartment block's rooftop water tank on July 20.

Gen Kamronvit Toopkra-

jang, chief of Provincial Region 1, said that one of the residents had seen the tenant of room 31 return to the apartment building with a young woman.

Areeyatat Kamonketsarak, 25, the tenant living in room 31, was nowhere to be found, but police contacted his mother, who admitted to police that her son had called her to say he had murdered a girl working in a karaoke bar and that he was hiding at a friend's place.

Police eventually tracked down Areeyatat, who confessed that a friend had given him the phone number of Ratree Mandee, 26, a native of Chiang Rai and employee at a local karaoke bar who wanted to buy some *ya bah* (methamphetamine).

Areeyatat told police that he called Ratree and arranged to meet her at Karn Karaoke at the Navanakorn industrial estate.

The pair returned to Areeyatat's room where they smoked *ya bah* and had sex, he told police.

After taking a shower, Areeyatat noticed that some of his *ya bah* stash was missing. Confronting Ratree, Areeyatat found 20 tablets hidden in her bag.


Areeyatat proceeded to beat Ratree until she stopped moving before strangling her with a shirt, he told police.

Stuffing her body into black bin liners, Areeyatat carried the dead girl to the roof of the building, where he squeezed the body into the water tank, he told officers.

Police charged Areeyatat with first-degree murder.

Residents of the apartment block have since vacated the premises, saying they are too frightened to live there, despite the owner pledging to replace the water tank and all of the building's water pipes.

Vets voice concerns over elephant abuse

he Veterinarians Foundation of Thailand has expressed concern over alleged abuse and exploitation of animals, especially elephants, at tourist attractions on Koh Samui.

Pornpirom Fungtakoon, a representative from the Veterinarian Foundation, said they are looking into practices used by tour operators on the island, such as elephant riding and begging with elephants to persuade tourists to buy food for the animals and have their pictures taken with them.

"We believe that some elephant tour operators are bringing the animals onto the island from elsewhere and may be mistreating or even abusing them, sometimes leading to their deaths," she said.

"We are aware of the popularity of elephant tours among visitors to Thailand, but we are keen to promote only healthy practices that do not harm the elephants," she added.

The foundation, which is currently looking into the mistreatment of elephants on several resort islands in Southern Thailand, called on people in the region to report such practices to authorities.

Missing diver's remains recovered. The skeleton of a scuba diver missing since 2006 has been retrieved from within the bowls of a shipwreck in waters off Koh Tao

Thomas Casagrande, a German diving instructor operating from Koh Tao, went missing in February 2006 after diving with friends to investigate a shipwreck site four kilometers off the island.

Friend's of Mr Casagrande

were said to have been conducting the search to recover his remains while a vessel from the Thai Royal Navy was carrying out training exercises nearby.

A team of 24 members of the Thai Royal Navy, including medical staff, joined in the search efforts, which later led to the recovery of the diver's skeleton, which was said to be stuck inside the engine room of the downed ship.

The wreckage is thought to be that of the ship *Unicorn*, which sank after being caught in a storm nearly 20 years ago, coming to rest on the seabed 51 meters beneath the surface. The site remains popular with diver and was given the nickname "Dog Food Wreck" because of the cargo it

was carrying when it sank, despite apparently being insured to carry tuna.

High oil prices jeopardize ferry service. Despite recent hikes in fares to cover the costs of rising oil prices, Seatran Ferry operators have announced their intention to reduce the frequency of trips to mainland Surat Thani.

Seatran Ferry General Manager Srisak Srisawat said that the company has no choice but to reduce the the number of boats crossing from Samui to Donsak due to rising oil prices and declining passenger numbers. "The company is running at a loss," he added

The company increased fare prices in April, but this has

been insufficient to cover operational costs, with eight scheduled trips per day now reduced to seven by cutting the 7pm departures at both ports.

Khun Srisak said that further reductions in the schedule may be implemented if the situation does not improve, adding that the service could be scrapped in the future.

Seatran now operates daily from Samui to Donsak and back from 6am to 6pm.

Dengue fever outbreak. Health officials have warned that Koh Samui and surrounding islands may be facing a dengue fever epidemic. Health department officials from Surat Thani said there have been 311 cases of the po-

Doctor Nattawut Prasertsiriphong of the public health department said that between January and June, the demographic most infected was people aged 15 to 24 years old.

No fatalities from the disease have been reported, but there are concerns that the virus may spread and infect those at highest risk: babies and the elderly.

Officials believe that unusually frequent rains over the past months may have contributed to the increased number of cases of the disease, which is transmitted by mosquitoes.

The health department has launched a program to halt the spread of the disease by urging residents to take precautions such as covering any areas that contain stagnant water and by keeping fish that eat mosquito larvae.

Extra vigilance has been called for and people are encouraged to seek immediate medical treatment if they suspect they have been infected. A number of health department officers have been stationed on Koh Samui and surrounding islands to be on call where cases of dengue have been reported.

Symptoms of the the infectious disease include a high fever and severe muscle and joint pain, which is why dengue is also known as Breakbone Fever.



Attacks continue despite 'ceasefire'in deep South

ttacks in the Deep South continued July despite the "ceasefire" announced in a video released that day by a group claiming to represent 11 underground insurgent groups in the southern border provinces.

At 2:30 pm July 17, one soldier was severely injured when his patrol unit was ambushed by insurgents. The shooting occurred on Krong Penang-Bannang Sata road in Ruemu village in Tambon Krong Penang in Yala's Krong Penang district.

The ceasefire video, said to be filmed in Germany, showed three men who claimed to lead 11 "underground" separatist groups. The leader of the men said, "From July 14 onwards, all the militant and political units of our group will support peace formation in Thailand."

Army chief General Anupong Paochinda identified the self-proclaimed leader in the ceasefire video as Malipeng Khan, a former separatist leader who was active from 1984 to 1987 and who tried but failed to unify various insurgent factions.

But an Army intelligence officer who claimed he met Malipeng in Egypt and Syria about a decade ago cast doubt on whether it was him or his brother, Shamsudin, as the person had dyed hair and a fake mustache.

Kasturi Mahkota, foreign affairs chief of the Pattani United Liberation Organization (Pulo), said he did not know the affiliation of the three men in the video.

Never too old. A 62-year-old father of a government prosecutor was arrested for theft in Trang's Pa Lian district after being caught running from a gold shop with a necklace on July 16.

Mak Lamsa was arrested by two patrol officers on a motorcycle after shopowner Teuanjai Phemphulchokkhana, 65, flagged them down and reported the theft.

K. Teuanjai, owner of the Thong Thaisawat gold shop, told police that Mak came into the shop and asked to look at a gold necklaces. As soon as she gave him the necklace, Mak ran from the shop. K. Teuanjai was chasing him down the street shouting for help when the two officers happened to drive by and come to her assistance, she said.

Mak told police that at the time of the theft, he was on the way to Thung Song, but ran out of money so decided to try and steal some gold. He added that he had recently split up with his wife and that his three children – a prosecutor, a teacher and a farmer – did not look after him at

Station stress. A police major held another officer hostage at gunpoint for more than three and a half hours at Police Region 9 Headquarters in Songkhla after his request for a transfer out of the Deep South was rejected.

At 1:30pm July 15, Maj Nan Phumket, 54, a crime suppression inspector at Yi Ngor Police Station in Narathiwat province, went to the regional police headquarters to speak to Region 9 Police Commissioner Lt Gen Panya Thiansatr to request a transfer out of the area.

After speaking to a senior officer, Maj Nan was told that he would have to wait until he had finished treatment at Prince of Songkla University Hospital where he was being treated for

On his way out of the building, Maj Nan stopped at the front desk and aimed his gun at the duty sergeant, Sen Sgt Maj Jaran Isaro. Maj Nan then removed his belt and tied it round Sen Sgt Maj Jaran's neck and ordered him to walk with him to the canteen next to the headquarters.

At the canteen, Maj Nan handcuffed the hostage and warned officers who were trying to persuade him to release Sen Sgt Maj Jaran that he would shoot him if they approached.

Senior officers negotiated with Maj Nan for more than three hours until Col Wichai Ketmuang, a former commanding officer of Maj Nan, arrived at the scene at 5:30 pm. After speaking with Col Wichai, Maj Nan agree to put down his gun and release Sen Sgt Maj Jaran.

Maj Gen Phongsak Nakwiiit, commander of Narathiwat Provincial Police, said that he had ordered for Maj Nan to be assessed by doctors to determine whether he was suffering from a mental condition. If so, Maj Nan would not be charged.

If, however, he was found to be of sound mind, he would be investigated by a police commission, Gen Phongsak said..

Gen Phongsak also called for the commanding officers of each police station to be vigilant for any stress or mental health issues among their officers.

Stakeout shootout. Police in Nakhon Sri Thammarat were shot at by a suspected ya bah (methamphetamine) dealer as they were arresting his 14-yearold accomplice July 17. No officers were injured in the inci-

Police said that an informant reported that a drug deal would take place at a house in Ban Lamnao subdistrict, Bang Khan district, on the afternoon of July 17. Officers staked out the house until 3 pm when a blue Ford pickup pulled up outside and a teenage boy got out and headed to the house.

When police moved in to arrest the boy, the man in the pickup opened fire on them with a pistol before speeding off. The boy, whose name was withheld for legal reasons, was arrested.

Police later found the pickup truck crashed by the side of the road about five kilometers from the scene of the shooting. In the pickup, police found a bag containing a 9mm pistol with 12 rounds of ammunition, 16 ya bah pills, a mobile phone and a notebook computer.

Police believe that after losing control of his vehicle and crashing by the side of the road, the suspect fled on foot into a nearby forest.

Lt Thammarat Somkhiowwan, deputy crime suppression inspector at Bang Khan Police Station, said that an informant had told police that the suspect was a

large-scale drug dealer known as "Aree", who had been released from prison about a week previ-

Since his release, Aree and a Bang Khan Civilian Defense Corps Volunteer had started selling ya bah in Bang Khan. Police are now hunting for the man, Lt Thammarat said.

angrove forests at Bangrong in Pa Khlok, once nearly destroyed by the impact of destructive encroachment, have returned to their former glory with the help of conscientious villagers.


The villagers are now reaping the rewards of their conservation efforts with the return of food from the water-logged forests and the increasing popularity of agro-tourism (agricultural tourism).

More than 10 years ago, the mainly Muslim population of Bangrong watched helplessly as their livelihoods were threatened by encroachment of the mangroves, which poisoned the water flowing through them. The destruction continued unabated until members of the local community rallied to restore the area and sought the backing of Phuket Provincial Agricultural Office to preserve the mangrove forest.

The encroachers eventually left and the poisons in the water abated, allowing the fishing community to return to its self-sufficient lifestyle, which now receives a boost from agro-tourism.

Now that the estuary is once again full of wildlife, it has become a popular place to eat, kayak and hike, giving visitors a chance to see how the surrounding community lives a peaceful life of fishing and marine farming.

First stop is the the project's floating restaurant serving a variety of fresh seafood dishes. After walking through mangroves to reach the restaurant, you can rent kayaks for the day or organize one of the other group excursions available, including trips on longtail boats or days out with fishermen. The longtail boats can take groups of up to 15 around the mangrove forest or to nearby



grass-roots travel experience. It began several years ago with an initial investment of 27,000 baht and three community members working as staff. There are now 14 kayaks available for hire and about 20 members of the community employed as staff and

"Their English skills are not great but they are learning all the time," said Samart Kerdsup, restaurant manager.

"Tourists come here all year round, even when it's raining, and the trips are educational. The trip to nearby Koh Khai is popular because the water is clear and good for snorkeling," said Khun Samart.

"The main purpose of our

baht and take in the wildlife and scenery at your own pace.

Along these trips you can expect to see a variety of interesting animals unique to mangroves. Fiddler crabs are a comical sight with their single bright, oversized claws giving them away as they scurry across the mud and dash in and out of their holes, while blenny fish, or mudskippers, do their evolutionary leaping from water to mud to tree root.

Other fish to be seen include wrestling half beaks - fighting fish unique to coastal regions of Southeast Asia.

Kanda Paenthong, an of-

ficer for Phuket Provincial Agricultural Office, said that Bangrong is one of 80 similar ecotourism projects around Thailand, but the only one in Phuket.

"It's source of learning about community enterprise following sufficiency economy prin-

cipals and it is a good model for other agrotourism projects," said Khun Kanda.

The Bangrong floating restaurant is open daily from 9 am to 7 pm. For more information or to make a reservation call 089-8724394.

Programs vary depending on weather conditions and some services are not available during Islamic holidays.



"My first experience in the kitchen was working part-time after school. After finishing high school I went to hotel school for two years and then went to a hotel school in Kuala Lumpur. After two years there, I went to Switzerland to study the culinary arts," he said.

"There, in management class, I met Khun Worasit, the owner of Sri Panwa. We had an idea of what to do in Phuket. But then in 2004 my father passed away, so I could not come to open Sri Panwa. I stayed with my family for three years and then I joined Sri Panwa. That was a year ago, already," he added.

"I came to work here because we had the same idea about 'Baba' food. Our concept is not fusion food. We don't combine Western or Thai food. For example, we take a normal white sauce, but for a Baba influence, we add an extra ingredient something local, say, lemongrass. This makes the recipe original," he explained.

'Baba is another word for Peranakan, which means 'descendants'. The word comes from


Chinese people who could not go back to China. They married local people, so the at home combined both Chi-


Baba food."

"Thailand and Malaysia have many dishes other countries don't have. My menu, for example, features a traditional Babastyle red sauce that combines chili, onion, garlic and ginger. What we do here is add tomato sauce, oyster and fish sauce.

"We try to create something new. For example, Thailand has very nice limes, so we combine it with our traditional homemade sauce to make it even better. Baba is two cultures become one, which is not fusion food. With fusion food, you just change the ingredients, but this is more than that," he added.

is only one of the re-incarnations of Vishnu.

Theravada Buddhism is essentially one of many Hindu sects. The ceremonial procedures, their timing and the mantras to be recited by any main-

stream Hindu sect is governed by the highest Hindu caste, the Brahmins, and it is these people that pass the knowledge down through the generations.

Chokechai Phurahong, is a 51-year-old Brahmin priest who

has been living on Phuket for more than 20 years. He explained that the language of Brahmins is, like the Thai language, derived from Pali-Sanscrit. Brahmin influences can be seen everywhere, in the surnames and names of most cities and people that have a strong Brahmin heritage.

He explained that he was born in Suphanburi, which is Sanskrit meaning "City of Gold" and the name Chokechai means "Good Luck". His family name derives from the famous Thai writer Suntorn Phu and a royal barge, though he did not go into the deeper Sanskrit explanation.

In Phuket, he is usually called Nakulisamunee or Brahmin Daeng. Although he has been a Buddhist from birth, he did not become interested in Brahminism until more than 10 years ago, following several of his ancestors, including his great-grandfather.

"Being a Brahmin means adhering to the principles of Brahminism and believing in Brahma as the creator of the world," said Brahmin Daeng.

One of five Brahmin priests in Phuket, Brahmin Daeng is one of only two senior priests in the province. However, he graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration from Ramkhamhaeng University, has a wife and a daughter, and leads a regular life – except for being a Brahmin priest.

Brahminism is embedded in Thai culture, and Brahmin Daeng plays a pivotal role in spiritual ceremonies, such as the candlelit processions around temples during Buddhist festivals.

"Brahmin ceremonies are part of Thai life and some are deeply integrated with Buddhist ceremonies," he explained.

There are two classes of Brahmin priest: a Royal Brahmin can conduct royal ceremonies, such as the annual Royal Ploughing Ceremony, while a general Brahmin priest is able to conduct general ceremonies for members of the public.

Brahmin Daeng is a general Brahmin, which means, he said, that he does not observe the eight Brahmin commandments as Indian Brahmins do. There are only 10 Royal Brahmins in Thailand, all living in Bangkok, who are seen at royal ceremonies.

"In Thailand, Brahminism is administered by the Brahmin Bureau in Bangkok, which is part of the Bureau of the Royal Household and where I studied to become a Brahmin priest.

"Most people become Brahmins through their family, but those who want to become Brahmin priests can do so through the Brahmin Bureau," he said.

Brahminism has two moral principles. Sanatana Dharma refers to the religious tradition of Hinduism, while Waitika Dharma refers to the moral principles outlined in the Vedas texts – one of the oldest pieces of literature in the world.

"There is evidence to show that Brahmins first came to Thai-

land during the Khmer era in places such as Nakhon Sri Thammarat," he added.

Brahmin Daeng, who follows a strict vegetarian diet, wears predominantly white, a pure color, when he is performing ceremonies. Among the ceremonies that he conducts are marriages, making merit for new properties and inviting spirits to live in spirit houses.

Ever wondered where the idea for spirit houses in Thailand came from? In Brahminism, guardian spirits are invited to spirit pra bhum, will then live in the spirit house to protect people in the main building, warding off bad

Brahmin Daeng can offer advice on the size and positioning of a spirit house. "You have to take care of the spirit house and the guardian spirits because you invited them to be with you; if you don't respect the spirits, your life might be unhappy," he

"The location and design of each spirit house, as well as the food and drink offered to the

should offer crab, shrimp, fish and local food to the guardian spirits," he added.

"Many people are curious as to why we use red boiled eggs as offerings. Eggs are a pure food and red is the most auspicious color for Brahminism as it is the color of the sun," said Brahmin Daeng.

Although there are very few Brahmin priests, their influence is everywhere and very much an integral part of Thai culture.

iz Westgate looked a little rattled and the rest of the Andaman Players stopped rehearsing and turned to her. "I was just wondering if I have time to throw up before my next line," she murmured.

Even a dose of food poisoning couldn't slow us down at that stage. We were mere days away from the première of Adjoined and, in less than a month, the Players had pulled together another brilliant original show.

It was hardly surprising that a few of us were starting the fray at the edges; that's a tough schedule even for the pros. But, by that point – far beyond the point of no return – this group of talented amateurs was running on pure adrenalin and if they were fraying, it wasn't showing on stage.

There's a nervous energy about rehearsals that grows exponentially the closer you get to P-Day (Performance Day) and it helps to push the actors beyond usual human limits, allowing them to ignore trivial matters such as life-threatening illnesses.

It also has a very positive effect on line learning and character development; actors focus on these to help them ignore the growing sense of anxiety that surrounds them.

That adrenal buzz carries right through to the after-show party, but the problems begin once the buzz disperses and all those frayed edges start to fall apart.

I've dubbed this medical phenomenon Post P-Day Syndrome in the hope that a silly name might embarrass me out of catching it again. I'll let you know.

The premier performance at the Playhouse in Patong was a blast. Tickets sold out days before we opened, which added extra oomph to the final rehearsals and we quickly arranged a return show for the following weekend, which again filled the

Part II, everybody was back in top form and pulled off another excellent performance.

Part of the success of this show must be attributed to David Shrubsole and his professional team at The Playhouse, who de-

signed the sets for the two oneact plays and were so practiced in flipping these sets between the plays that, by the time I made my way from the sound booth at the back of the theater to the stage, they'd pretty much finished the changeover.

Working with pros such as this really adds sparkle to a show. David has invited the Players to be a part of the Phuket Fringe Festival he is putting together for the end of September.

David is currently jetting around the country collecting acts for it, including performers from Rajabhat University's Chiang Mai campus. Karen Alexander of the

Hamilton, whose character Phuket Dance Academy will be bringing her troupe along to add a bit of razzle-dazzle and David has also received commitments

from some of the island's top performers, including Ricky Zen, the Budu Band and Kamel Sougoi, with several others on the verge of jumping on board.

It's still early in the planning stage, but it

looks set to be 10 days of serious performance fun. Watch this column for more news.







Dressed to impress



orwegian Petter Solberg finished second in the Acropolis Rally in early June. While that in itself is not astonishing – Solberg is a former world champion rally driver – the fact that he was driving the new Subaru Impreza WRX STI is remarkable, for this was the new car's rally debut.

The new version of the rally-inspired Impreza WRX STI is now available in Thailand and it is a far cry from the outgoing model. This one, while still offering amazing performance, is a little more user-friendly and offers a number of creature comforts that were not available in the previous version.

The interior is finished in black and silver and is supremely comfortable. The front seats are finished in Alcantara fabric and leather. Although Recaro sports seats are offered by the manufacturer as a factory option, they are horrifically expensive and are not part of the package on sale here.

Power steering is standard with a three-spoke leather covered wheel, embossed with the STI logo, and a center console, again with the STI logo, but one that illuminates when the head-lamps are on.

The instrument panel combines three dials: a tachometer between a speedometer and fuel gauge in a single module illuminated in a tasteful shade of cherry red.

When the ignition key is first turned, all needles of the three meters swing up to their maximums and quickly fall back to their original positions. Why, nobody seems to know or is able to



explain, but it's a traditional Su-

baru thing.

The new Impreza WRX is a five-door hatchback, offering room for five adults and luggage, while power comes from the familiar turbocharged flat-four "boxer" engine, which produces an impressive 300 bhp (227 kW) at 6,400 rpm. Torque output is equally strong at 422 Nm, delivered at 4,400 rpm.

Mated to a six-speed manual gearbox, the WRX features permanent all-wheel drive, with a central electronic differential that the driver can control if required. Leave it in the auto position and the on-board computer decides for itself which configuration – front, rear or all wheels – to apportion the available torque.

On the road, the Impreza is nimble, reacting well to steering input. There is a certain amount of torque steer from the front wheels, but it is not intrusive. However, point it in a straight line and floor the throttle to watch the horizon come towards you surprisingly quickly. The brakes are excellent, requiring less pressure on the pedal than the previous model.

Safety features include eight airbags, including dual curtain bags on each side, and three-point seat belts for the rear

The hood is designed to disperse frontal-impact energy as one of the low-impact features to minimize the risk of injury to pe-

On the road, the Impreza is destrians or damage to other vele, reacting well to steering hicles in a collision.

Reduced weight and improvements to the engine have contributed to lower emissions than the previous model, as well.

Inside, the car has a number of pockets and compartments, including door pockets to hold bottles, while two tour-size golf bags or five carry-on bags will fit comfortably in the trunk. In-car entertainment includes a center console that accommodates up to eight CDs.

Looking after Subaru buyers in the region is Motor Image Group, a wholly owned subsidiary of Tan Chong International, which is listed on the Hong Kong Stock Exchange.

Motor Image introduced Subaru in Singapore more than 10 years ago. It now has outlets in China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Taiwan, and Thailand.

However, if you want one, you'll have to go to Bangkok, as there aren't any distributors in Phuket, but it's worth the trek if you want if you want something fast, safe and just a little different.

Booze mover shifting drink by the truckload

PHUKET CITY: Wines, beers and spirits: the staple ingredients of any successful bar. For the Phuket consumer, there are a number of places to buy alcohol – pubs, clubs, supermarkets – but for a business on the island, choosing who delivers your booze is less straightforward.

Step up BeerPhuket, a company that has taken the island's alcohol market by the horns, offering a new distribution service.

Danny Cornish, marketing and sales manager of O'Malley's Irish pub in Phuket City, founded BeerPhuket and the company began operating five months ago, supplying the island with alcohol.

"There is a gap in the [alcohol] market where there is a real lack of quality service. We have our bar and we saw a problem with the way we were buying our alcohol stock. It's difficult to buy alcohol here as you have to pick it up yourself, which takes time. There was no company in Phuket offering a reliable delivery service," said Mr Cornish.

Foreign businesses in Phuket sometimes find that buying alcohol wholesale presents problems in communicating with Thai sellers, he said, adding that BeerPhuket overcame this issue by employing Thai- and Englishspeaking staff.

BeerPhuket, which employs 11 staff, operates on the island without a major competitor, added Mr Cornish.

"BeerPhuket has already made a 15% profit on the initial investment," he said.

Through its fleet of five delivery vans, BeerPhuket offers same-day delivery on orders place before midday. "All we ask is for a minimum order of 3,000 baht," he added.

Orders under 3,000 baht are subject to a 200-baht delivery charge.

With a 1,125-square-meter warehouse in Samkong, Phuket City, BeerPhuket supplies its 200 regular customers with 400 orders a month, with an average order of 30,000 baht. Customers order by phone, email or fax, said Mr Cornish.

"We have many suppliers in Bangkok, where most of our stock comes to us from," he added

The target markets for BeerPhuket are hotels, resorts and businesses. "There are 30 hotels, pubs and restaurants in Phuket that use our services," said Mr Cornish.

While BeerPhuket suffered a brief boom period when trading began five months ago, the past three months have seen a 35% decrease in orders, for which Mr Cornish blames a combination of low-season slowdown and general problems with the economy.

However, Mr Cornish added, "We are still busy at the moment and high season will be here in September.

"We cross-check our prices weekly with other wholesalers," said Mr Cornish, adding that BeerPhuket, which also supplies cigarettes, releases a monthly newsletter with information about the company's latest products and prices.

Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac to tighten their belts

he chairman of the US Federal Reserve, Ben Bernanke, is working very closely with US Treasury Secretary Henry "Hank" Paulson. They have identical problems to solve and these problems appear to be getting

The credit crunch and the US housing market, which is still falling in value, have taken matters to a new level with the inclusion of the Federal National Mortgage Association, better known as "Fannie Mae", and the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation (aka "Freddie Mac") in the focus of financial markets.

These two organizations are best described as governmentsponsored enterprises (GSEs). They supply mortgages, normally of smaller maximum amounts, to assist working Americans in becoming homeowners.

Both Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac are listed on the New York Stock Exchange (NSYE) and own or back more than US\$5.3 trillion in mortgage debt. Worries about the low capital base of these organizations, combined with losses, has caused a virtual run on the shares of these organizations.

The old joke goes, "You owe a bank \$20,000, you have a problem – you owe a bank one billion dollars, they have a problem." Shareholders in Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac have taken huge losses this year, culminating in a loss of more than 40% on July

This had to produce a reaction from the federal government. There are several very serious consequences to the current situation, including the fact that hundreds of billions of dollars are invested in their bonds by everyone from Chinese investors to Japanese banks. Even Swiss Re saw its shares fall when it disclosed it was holding US\$9.8 billion in GSE bonds.

The US government cannot simply ignore the problem. If it did, the lending market across the board would come to a virtual halt. Recession would be guaranteed – a nice deep, long-lasting one; something that economists could include in university courses when explaining how to murder an economy.

Bernanke, in his role as US

Federal Reserve chairman, has a standing semi-annual date with the Senate Banking Committee. This time, he arranged for Hank Paulson to be with him.

Paulson simply wants to bail out Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. Naturally, the senators wanted to know who was going to

pay for the bailout. Paulson made the point that if the US government is prepared to back this situation to the hilt, it would win. He simply said that if you are carrying a bazooka, it is unlikely that revolves around confidence and

This was to stop the senate allocating a fixed amount of money for a bailout. Markets love targets. Even if it's a trillion dollars, it gives something concrete. If they believe that they are facing a government that has virtually unlimited funds, it changes the situation.

a need to "de-leverage" the economy. Credit facilities are going to remain tight for some time. However, Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac are not insolvent, but they must be run better with tighter regulations.

Who should constitute Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac's shareholders has been questioned. Should they be public or government? The reality is that this time, private shareholders have had to suffer the initial pain. Had these agencies been owned by government, the taxpayer would have had to pay out.

The Federal Reserve has also been taking over the management of several banks and other lenders. The largest in July was Indy Mac, a Californian lender with US\$32 billion in assets on paper and a bankrupt business model.

Chairman Bernanke told the Senate Banking Committee that the whole situation had still to reach bottom. The reality is that it is only after these events have finished that will we be able to assess the future. Negative economic conditions will not remain with us forever.

Financial markets often note the need for capitulation before a new upward cycle can begin. A lean, mean, family saga

aile Meloy is the 36-year-old author of two novels and a book of short stories. All have been lavishly, even hysterically, praised. So when Philip Roth writes, "The quiet, unastonished precision with which Maile Meloy depicts the extent to which everything now goes haywire in socalled ordinary American life is an impressive achievement, literary and otherwise," what you do is pick up the book.

Her first novel, Liars and Saints (Scribner, New York, 2003, 260pp), is a five-generation family saga, running from World War II to the turn of the millennium, that takes up a mere 260 pages. So the epic sweep is accomplished at a breakneck pace. And herein lies the book's force. Its charm comes from the eight family members who swap the narrative. Maile Meloy doesn't go for elaborate description or intricate emotional states. The plain prose grabs you from the beginning:

'They were married during the war, in Santa Barbara, after Mass one morning in the old Mission church. Teddy was solemn; he took the Mass very seriously. Yvette, in a veiled hat and an ivory dress that wasn't a gown, was distracted by the idea that she was in California, without her father there to give her away, and she was about to change her life and her name. 'I,



Yvette Grenier, take you, Theodore Santerre...' It all sounded formal and strange, as if someone else were saying the words, until she realized with surprise that it was her."

This is the sunny idyllic beginning of a 60-year saga of mad jealousy, unwanted pregnancy, deception, incest, lesbianism, wanderlust, abandonment, religious ecstasy and murder. While outwardly lurid, Meloy tells her tale with discipline and restraint, grounded in the realism of the characters. It's that rare breed: a literary page

The first chapter is told from Yvette's perspective. She's abandoned her family in Canada to marry an American flyboy who can't even speak French. She has two daughters: Margot and Clarissa.

In the next chapter Theodore (Teddy) goes off to fly fighters off aircraft carriers in the Pacific. He's madly tormented by jealousy over his beautiful wife. In the third, Clarissa and Margot go off to Catholic grammar school. Clarissa will nurse a waii? We learn in the next chapter that

lifelong hate for her perfect older sister, In the fourth, 16year-old Margot becomes pregnant by Mr Tucker, her high school dance teacher.

The narrative rushes relentlessly forward, each character's take on reality blinkered by their own misconceptions. Thus from Clarissa's point of view, she is at her happiest to have her beloved father all to herself while Margot goes to spend her junior year with cousins in France and her mother retreats to a convent to give birth to Jamie.

But we learn from Yvette that Margot is the real mother of Jamie who grows up thinking that Yvette is his mother and Margot his sister. This is not as outlandish as it might sound. Actor Jack Nicholson grew up under exactly the same misapprehension.

Jamie turns into a wild teenager but

finds purpose in life when a Jesuit priest introduces him to the guitar. But Teddy distrusts the priest, so Yvette arranges for him to spend the summer in Hawaii with Clarissa. What is Clarissa doing in Ha-

> she has married her college boyfriend, Henry, and they're living in Navy married quarters.

Back in California, Henry becomes involved in local politics, neglecting Clarissa and her infant daughter Abby. Clarissa abandons him, driving with her baby cross-country to Louisiana, where Margo is living with her rich chemist husband.

Who should she find there but Jamie, who's fled home after a titanic fight

Eventually – in the 1500s or thereabouts – pockets began to be "sewn into or on clothing, for carrying a purse or other small articles", according to the Oxford English Dictionary (OED).

Pocketbook didn't come into use until the 1600s, but almost as soon as it did, it was used to mean, among other things, "wallet" or "money holder" pretty much what purse originally meant, though by this point the word "purse" had acquired additional, general-purpose meanings.

The OED's earliest citation for purse as something that would tend to belong to a woman, however, is dated 1955; its citations for pocketbook in this sense date

back to 1830. Perhaps you should remind your wife that she doesn't need a pocket to have pocket money nor a suit to pack a suitcase.

There is a trend in the sciences toward dropping the "-al" suffix for adjectives. For example, psychological becomes psychologic, geological becomes geologic and biological becomes biologic. When is it correct to use these new forms?

Actually, none of those words are truly new – all six appear in my Webster's New International Dictionary, second edition, from 1954.

Nor are questions about "ic" and "-ical" pairs new. HW Fowler wrote about them incisively in his 1926 Dictionary of Modern English Usage, though most of the specific words he considered, such as casuistic and

casuistical, diabolic and diabolical. don't trouble us anymore.

As Fowler pointed out, the words in some pairs – for example, politic and political, economic and economical – are distinct, with distinct meanings. That's all to the good. "Every well established differentiation." Fowler wrote, "adds to the precision and power of the language."

But he also argued that "when two forms coexist, and

there are not two senses for them to be assigned to, it is clear gain that one should be got rid of."

Fowler wasn't suggesting we choose either "-ic" or "-ical" and use it across the board. Rather, he was recommending we consider undifferentiated pairs with an eye to what "appears to be the winning side".

So let's do that. Determining the winner is much easier now, in the Internet era, than it was when Fowler had to read stacks of newspapers to search for evidence.

Psychological is so far ahead of psychologic that the latter is hardly worth talking about. Similarly with geological and

geologic. If the US Geological Survey ever changes its name, get back to me.

But biologic does have a differentiated sense – not that it's always used this way. It properly means, as Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary defines it, "a biological product (as a vaccine or blood serum) used in medicine".

Today, we have biologic mesh, employed in surgery, and biologic drugs. Biologic agents are good; biological agents, the weaponry of biological warfare, are

Thus the word biologic is a rare thing; a once-useless variant whose time has come.

The pros and cons of a Patong election

As this issue hits the streets, the people of Patong will go to the polls, with outgoing Mayor Pian Keesin and Somkiet Kuru contesting the seat of Patong Mayor.

It is an interesting twist that Khun Somkiet is one of Khun Pian's former deputy mayors. Whether he is a mayoral candidate as K. Pian's friend or foe remains to be seen.

However, K. Pian's "right hand" and also a deputy mayor for the past four years, Chairat Sukkabal, has said that he would remain loyal to K. Pian. On the campaign trail, he's averred, "A vote for Pian is a vote for me."

Over the years, Khun Chairat has become the "face" of Patong Municipality for most foreigners. He's also been one of the main "go to guys" for major investment projects in the town.

To be clear, the mayor can choose anyone he likes to be his deputy. Phuket Election Committee (PEC) Director Supap Akkam has confirmed the title does not indicate an elected official, which means that a deputy mayor does not need to stand for election and does not need to hold a seat on the municipality council.

However, the nominee must be approved by the governor before he can become deputy mayor.

It has been with the help of these two tigers that K. Pian has ruled. When he rose to power in 2004, K. Pian had just three fellow Rak Patong (Love Patong) members on the 18-seat council. Throughout his entire first term, every proposal had to pass muster with the 15 Patong Progress party councilors in opposition.

Similarly, in the election that installed him as mayor, K. Pian beat rival Songserm Kepsap by just 147 votes. In that election, of Patong's 9,213 eligible voters, only 5,997 turned out for the poll.

K. Pian received 2,934 votes and Khun Songserm 2,787.

Four years later, it is with some irony that the Sunday election in the resort boomtown will be much the same. Patong Town Clerk Phunsak Naksena says that of town's registered population of nearly 19,000, 11,499 are eligible voters, who must be registered as living in Patong for at least a year.

For one of the candidates to become mayor in the fastest-growing town on an island that has become a major foreign-currency cash cow for the country, it will take a majority of only 5,720 votes – even less after the no-voters and spoiled ballots have been discounted.

Nowhere else in Thailand will so few people with the right to vote have so much sway over the fortunes of so many other people.

Annual Bangkok budget shortchanges Phuket

just received a report that Phuket has an annual budget of 154 million baht for next year, which isn't a large sum. The total budget for the country is 1.8 billion baht, which is divided between each province based on a number of factors, including population.

The five provinces along the Andaman coast (Phuket, Phang Nga, Krabi, Ranong and Trang) have also been granted 161 million baht for joint projects, such as new roads, road improvements and marketing for tourism.

High prices affecting tour**ism.** We have to accept that the global economy is affecting everyone, especially with regards to the price of gas. I met several foreign investors in Phuket recently and they told me they are worried about real estate in

Investors have stopped earning money on their investments because of the economy and they are waiting for the central government to stabilize the economy.

Investors are concerned that the government might implement new investment polices with regards to visas, tax reductions and so on. They must wait and see what happens.

With regards to the problem of gas prices in Thailand, consumers are still unsure about running their cars on NGV (natural

gas for vehicles) or LPG (liquefied petroleum gas) because they are waiting for the government to form a policy on the issue.

I think the number of tourists who will come to Phuket this green season will be about 20% fewer than last year. The occupancy rate for hotels in Phuket is currently about 40%, compared with 60% last year.

I have heard that many hotels are already booked at about 80% for the coming high season.

Tourism in Pattaya has also dipped, especially at weekends. There are much fewer tourists there, foreigners and Thais. When I am in Bangkok for meetings, I notice that there are less vehicles on the roads.

People who want to travel believe that the cost of fuel affects everything, including the price of plane tickets. Some airlines have canceled flights as a

Education tours. Cherng Talay Municipality and Wichit Municipality are planning an educational tour of Italy and Australia to learn more about public security in those countries.

They have invited the vicegovernors to lead a committee to travel there, which I think is a good idea to help Phuket come up with a better security system based on the budget we have.

We have only one educational tour a year with a limited number of people who can join

recently had the chance to hold a PC Group Therapy session at a meeting of the Rotary Club of Patong Beach. In this column I'll tackle the questions they had about Internet in Phuket. Next week I'll talk about a grab-bag of questions about Windows, antivirus, spyware and much more.

What is the fastest Internet connection I can get?

A. That's the Number 1 question I hear, everywhere I go – and for good reason. With the notable exception of CAT HiNet, Internet connections in Phuket have been abysmal. The good news is that they're getting better, as I described in this column last week. For the first time since I arrived in Phuket eight years ago, Internet access is finally starting to reach reasonable speeds for most people, most of the time.

Six months ago, the only way you could get an Internet connection fast enough to play a YouTube video or stream music was with CAT's pricey 2,782 baht-a-month HiNet line, which is available only in some areas.

The HiNet service ran up to 1,600Kbps (thousands of bits per second) during the mornings, but dropped off to 500-800Kbps in the afternoons. To get a feel for the speeds involved, 1,600 Kbps is fast enough to watch a small video without having it freeze and leap incomprehensibly; 500Kbps is not.

Many people around the island are now reporting speeds in excess of 2,000Kbps fairly regularly, particularly with the TT&T MaxNet service. However, con-

nection speeds still taper off in KHUN WOODY'S the afternoons, depending on location. For ex-

ample, Phuket City seems to be faster than Kata in the afternoons.

Right now the best deal for most locations is TT&T's Max-Net service, which costs about 1,000 baht a month. I am switching all of my shops, the bakery and my home office over to TT&T's Premiere MaxNet service, rated at download speed of 3Mbps for 2,129 baht a month. I'm also installing several personal lines from TOT at various locations around the island. The TOT lines are rated at 1Mbps and download at 499 baht a month.

Several people have noted that the TOT Silvercyber service

Goldcyber (1,000 baht a month). Many people have complained to me that YouTube videos accessed over TOT connections won't play; videos get marked "This Video Not Available". I'll have more on that topic in coming weeks.

What's the best wireless Internet? How do I get it?

A. That's always the Number 2 question I hear, everywhere I go. If you can't get a phone line or if you want to be able to take your Internet connection with you, wireless broadband is the way to go. Unfortunately, there's a lot of snake oil being sold for very high prices - caveat emptor (buyer beware) remains the watchword for consumers.

To be clear, the kind of

people overlook the fact that free wireless Internet is available at many locations around the island, using plain old-fashioned – and very effective - Wi-Fi connec-

GPRS uses old mobile phone Internet-access technology. You can expect about 40-50Kbps download speed, which is fast enough to retrieve small quantities of email or look at some websites, but not much more.

It's available anywhere you can get a mobile phone connection – even many miles offshore. To use GPRS, you have to have a mobile phone that supports GPRS (most modern ones do), a cable or Bluetooth adapter that connects your mobile phone to your computer (one probably came with the phone) and an account with the phone company that includes GPRS.

For many foreigners, that last part is hard, particularly if you're accustomed to using "refill cards" for your mobile phone. To set up an account, ask AIS (better known as 1-2-call), DTAC or True for GPRS.

You will need a copy of your passport and work permit. If you don't have a work permit, the usual advice is to take a Thai friend along who will sign up for you. However, the friend will be held responsible if you skip town and don't pay your phone bill...

Both AIS and DTAC offer unlimited GPRS access for 999 baht per month. I'll be writing about True's GPRS service in the coming weeks.

The EDGE service is identical to GPRS, except it uses a marginally faster - and significantly more expensive - card instead of your current mobile phone. EDGE service works everywhere that your mobile phone works, including way out on the water, almost all the way to Langkawi.

You can buy EDGE cards at many computer outlets. Expect to pay 8,000 baht or more. A more expensive EDGE card does not translate into faster access: EDGE download speeds are a function of signal strength, not the card's capabilities, and EDGE download speeds rarely go over 120Kbps.

Note that several of the more popular – and more expensive – EDGE cards are "Air Cards" made by Sierra Wireless, which holds the trademark on the term "Air Card". Don't be confused: if you buy your Air Card anyplace other than CAT, you will not get the CAT EV-DO service and you'll be stuck with a card that runs perhaps one-quarter as fast as EV-DO.

The next step up, 1X, is only available from CAT. There's a CAT office on Phang Nga Rd in Phuket City and another at the southern end of Phang Muang Rd (the new north-south road) in Patong, just after the pavement

1X is only slightly faster than EDGE and coverage in Phuket is not 100%, particularly outside of the main populated areas. Although CAT has several options, most people get 1X telephones – which look and act just like desk phones, except there's no phone cord – then plug their computers into the phone. The phones cost about 3,000 baht and up; service costs 800 baht per month for unlimited Internet ac-

By far the fastest wireless connection available today is CAT's EV-DO service. If you go to the CAT office and take your laptop, they'll set it all up. The CCU-680 card costs 10,900 baht plus about 800 baht per

Somsak refuses to hang up his gloves

Former WBA super bantamweight champion Somsak Sithchatchawal was back in the ring on July 11. Four months after losing to Poonsawat Kratingdaenggym, Somsak, now known as Somsak Singwangcha, scored a six-round points win over an Indonesian fighter known only as "Zoelfidal".

Somsak weighed in at 130lbs for the bout, 8lbs more than in his last fight. Somsak's promoter, Kokiet Panichayarom, plans to get the Thai a shot at the 126lbs title sometime next year, but winning any title other than a regional one is a long shot.

His weight was blamed for his loss to Poonsawat, but many of Somsak's opponents have rocked the Lampang native and it's clear that his brutal bout earlier with Mahyar Monshipour took its toll.

Somsak looked shaky against Zoelfidal and was hurt

throughout the bout. His chin is gone, his legs are gone and he eats far too many punches. If he faces current WBA champion Chris John, the Indonesian will batter him from pillar to post. Somsak is a shot fighter and can no longer compete with upperechelon bruisers.

Meanwhile, after suffering a devastating third-round knockout at the hands of South African fighter Vusi Malinga last month, Veeraphol Sahaprom seemed certain to retire. Veeraphol, however, has denied retiring from boxing and is instead taking time off to heal. This is the nature of boxing, as many champions have found it impossible to leave the ring behind, instead ending up punished for returning.


Veeraphol is now busy preparing Napapol Kittisakchokchai for his September bout against Toshiaki Nishioka for the WBC super bantamweight interim title.

Considered by many to be one of the best fighters in boxing,

Israel Vasquez of Mexico currently holds the regular championship and may defend his title in September against Rafael Marquez. The bout would be the fourth in a row between Vasquez and Marquez, reminiscent of the old rivalries in boxing, including Zale and Graziano, and Robinson and LaMotta.

To give an idea of the difference of opposition between Vasquez and Napapol, in Napapol's five most recent bouts, his opponents have records totaling 40 wins, 15 losses and four draws. The opponents of Vasquez have 222 wins, eight losses and 2 draws.

Few people in the industry believe the Thai deserves an interim title shot, much less a shot at Vasquez's title, but this is modern-day boxing. Interim title shots, once given only because a champion was unable to defend his title for a brief period, are now given regularly to earn additional revenue for the sanctioning bodies of the sport.

On July 27, Terdsak Jandaeng will try to stay in contention for a world title when he travels to Zamboanga City in the Philippines to face up-and-coming Filipino prospect Eric Canoy as part of a Thailand-versus-Philippines card.

Terdsak, nicknamed "The Pit Bull", is best known for his three losses: a seventh-round TKO to Juan Manuel Marquez of Mexico and points losses to Joan Guzman and Steve Luevano. Although he lives up to his moniker, he'll need more strategy and technique and less blood and guts if he is to win a world title. But first, he'll need to get past Canoy. The undefeated Filipino needs to beat the Thai in order to reach the next rung on the ladder.

In a Thai-Filipino bantamweight battle on July 8, Pichitchok Singmanassak (14-7, 6 KOs) was pounded for seven rounds before finally succumbing to Jason Egera (10-2, 5 KOs) in a WBO Asia Pacific championship match.

Virtually every main event in Thailand – or the world, for that matter – is for some sort of a title.

As long as television stations refuse to allow non-title main events, ridiculous title fights will continue and bouts between legitimately exciting fighters will continue to be passed over.

In Indonesia, yet another fight involving Chris John has been canceled. John, the WBA featherweight champion, was scheduled to defend his title on July 26 against British Commonwealth champion Jackson Asiku.

For the second time in a row, the promoter of John's bout has failed to produce the necessary fund, thus forcing the cancelation.

An offer of US\$150,000 is on the table for Chris John to fight Chonlatarn Piriyapinyo in Thailand. The previous offer was US\$100,000, but it is unlikely the Indonesian will come to Thailand as his reported asking price is US\$200,000 per fight.

Construction Update

he total cost of Phuket's Big Buddha image on top of the Nakkerd Hills between Kata-Karon and Chalong is predicted to surpass 100 million baht, said Suporn Vanichkul, President of the Mingmongkol Faith 45 committee, which is raising funds for the project.

K. Suporn told the *Gazette* that the structural work of the Big Buddha is almost finished and that work on the jade exterior is about 80% complete, with the front of the image completely covered and a portion of the back still to be finished.

"We began work on the jade covering about a year ago. The jade was imported from Myanmar. Each sheet is 15 by 15 centimeters and 2cm thick. We use epoxy glue on the body of the image to give a strong bond. It is very difficult work because the jade is like glass and a strong adhesive is needed," he said.

Work on the Big Buddha image, known officially as Phra Puttamingmongkol Akenakkiri, began six years ago. The completed structure will be 45 meters tall and 25 meters wide at the base.

After the jade exterior of the body has been attached, the 40 lotus petal images around the base of the Big Buddha will be decorated

"Each lotus petal is 6m long. We will cover them with sheets of marble from Saraburi province. This will take about one year to complete," said K. Suporn.

"Alongside the Buddha image, work has been carried out on the concrete access road that runs from the foot of the hill. The road is about four kilometers long and we have already paved the sharpest corners and the steepest parts for safety. Only about 2km of the road still needs to be paved," he said.

"The total cost of the project

now stands at 60 million baht," he added.

Inside the image will be a 436-square-meter museum to display Buddhism exhibitions. Work

on the museum will be done after the lotus base is finished, followed by work on a meditation park and a grass area for candlelit processions, said K. Suporn.

"We need about 20 million baht to complete the work on the statue, road and museum. We then need another 20 million baht for the meditation park and procession area. The total cost of the project will be about 100 million baht," he said.

"It is amazing to see the work being done with help from many people, including monetary donations and help from experts in the field of construction. Prasit Lubliam joined the team as our Buddha image expert, while Burapa Rodari is our resident expert on all the stone decoration," he added.

"We have recieved donations from all over the world, even from people who are not Buddhists. Some Muslims from Turkey were unable to donate money, but gave us their flags to decorate the image with.

"We now have tourists visiting every day, including big groups from hotels and resorts around the island. The tourists are impressed by the work and they have been donating money. We get about 400 to 500 visitors a day at weekends," said K. Suporn.

"The image helps people to gain an insight into the fundamentals of Buddhism. People who come to see the image are curious to know what our aim is, and so we explain it to them," he said.

"Buddhism teaches people to be kind, loving and forgiving, which I think is a common aim for everyone," he added.

The Big Buddha image, which is 400 meters above sea level, is sat in the *pang marnvichai* meditation posture.



he homes of Saisawan seem to float on their beachfront plot at Bang Tao. The modern design conceived for opulent outdoor living by the late Tucker Bishop focuses on providing residents with breathtaking spaciousness.

The curved roofs of the separate living, dining areas and master bedroom are shaped like those of aircraft hangers, reaching over five meters high with walls comprised mainly of sliding glass doors to make the most of the project's beachfront breezes.

Managing Sales Director of Tawan Properties Ian Spurdle explained that developing the design on the 1.2-rai plot took nine months and was conceived to capture the essence of beachfront living through a sense of openness and harmony with the elements.

"This is a very special piece of land. It's the last large plot of beachfront land [at Bang Tao] where you can walk from the garden straight onto the beach.

With this in mind, we wanted the design to represent a modern beach house, but something very different from the contemporary Thai style that has become common," he said.

"The brief we gave the three architects who initially competed to be the project's designers was for a modern beach house with lots of Asian elements, but nothing over the top. It had to be intuitively Asian, comfortable and practical," he added.

The end result is eight secluded villas in a resort-like environment, which are still under construction, with each villa comprised of three separate pavilions.

On the upper floor of the two-story bedroom complex are three bedrooms, each with an ensuite bathroom and a private balcony separated from the other balconies by shrubbery. On the lower floor is the large master bedroom as well as a grand living area and a study or games room.

These common areas for relaxing, coupled with the en-

trance hall and a spiraling staircase leading to the guest bedrooms, give the impression that the home is part of a luxury resort

Another feature adding to the resort feel, is the expansive pool deck running along the front of the home with an open-air sala and barbecue area replete with

"Many Thai-style designs are inspired by temples and use clay tiles, but we wanted a more interesting shape and materials, so we used cedar shaped to look like airplane wings – something you rarely see – which helped give the project a distinctive character," said Mr Spurdle.

"We used locally sourced materials as much as possible, such as limestone for the pavings and sandstone for the walls. Inside, teak has been used for the floors.

"A lot of glass has been used to allow the homes to be well lit with natural light. Teak also makes up much of the structure, which although an expensive

choice, complements the beachhouse concept," he added.

The master bedroom, main living and dining area and sala surround the pool, which is lined with volcanic rock from Bali. Each of the areas has large, tinted glass doors that give direct access to the pool and allow the sea breeze to flow through.

Adding a natural touch, the dining area set back from the living area is surrounded by water.

"For the kitchens [there is a an open-air cooking area outside], we have used imported resin for the counter surfaces as it is easier to maintain than black granite, which can become stained from oil splashes when cooking. These stains on granite are very difficult to remove, whereas the resin is durable and easy to look after," said Mr Spurdle.

Lighting can be controlled electronically throughout the house and garden for different moods, from romantic to vibrant.

"We wanted as much natural light to enter the property as possible, so we made the ceiling

as high as possible. The roofs extend so that direct sunlight doesn't come into the rooms, but glass partitions at the top of the walls indirectly allow light in. The roofs also hide the air-conditioning units.

"We don't imagine that Thais will like the design, but it will appeal to Europeans, particularly French and Italians because of the modern feel. We expect owners to work with their own interior designers to choosing furniture that suits them," Mr Spudle

The master bathroom is designed to be simple yet elegant using polished limestone. It also opens out onto a little secluded garden.

Altogether, the homes are luxuriously stunning, yet simple and practical. The design, although unique, isn't overzealous or too rich. It simply blends with the surroundings and offers complete comfort on the beach front and an ideal place to have guests over for a meal or even a few nights.





unting season is now open and the "woods" are teeming with "bears". We've seen a rapid regression in global and regional growth, so it seems that if you want to run with the bulls, a plane ticket to Pamplona would be the most likely way to accom-

Here in Thailand, snack boxes full of cash seem easier to come by than boxes of chocolate and what appears to be the eminent demise of the Samak government is causing uncertainty for overseas investors.

While this column appears in the Gazette, and thus to its wide range of readers abroad, I yearn to return to the routine issues of the local property market. Fortunately - or perhaps unfortunately, depending on where you sit - the local property market remains highly leveraged and somewhat dependent on foreign buyers. In short, the fate of Phuket's market outlook goes well beyond this island's shores.

As the world turns at an increasingly active and reactionary pace, so do events in our own backyard. The critical questions are what threats and opportunities exist in the Phuket property market today and where will trends take us on this rollercoaster ride.

Given the huge across-theboard fall in sales demand during the first half of 2008, the question on every developer's tongue is: when will the mass of buyers return? With pockets of growth, such as strata-titled freehold condominiums in prime locations, together with resales of upper-tier luxury villas, generally the wind is out of the sails in market momentum.

In the short to medium term, an ongoing US recession, global oil shortage and hyperinflation point to challenging investment conditions.

Tourism dominates Phuket's fortunes and despite 2007's five-million-plus visitors, ongoing

oil crises will have a marked impact on travel. Much of he current growth has been as a byproduct of the entry of a multitude of low-cost airline carriers

Over the past few months, we've seen Jet Star cease Singapore flights and Nok Air is now in the throes of a fiscal crises. In all likelihood, there will be a culling of the herd within the LCC sector. Airlines that stand to suffer are those that operate on lower margins and simply don't have the balance sheets to ride out losses from astronomical increases in operating costs. For all

the industries that depend on tourism, lower airlift capacity will mean reduced tourism numbers.

At the time of going to press, Orient Thai, which also operates One Two Go, announced they had suspended all flights until September 15. Whether this was due to rising fuel prices, as CEO Udom Tatiprosongchai announced, or due to growing pressure for action against the airline for the crash of flight OG269 in Phuket on September 16 last year, has yet to be seen.

Today's hotel room pipeline of new supply highly favors products intended for the five-star market, with substantial new inventory entering over the next 12 to 36 months.

Market fundamentals of supply and demand indicate that average room rates during the absorption period would most likely flatten or decline.

Should the region experience a large-scale economic downturn, hotel rates would be affected across the board, with pressure from upper-tier hotels hitting mid-market hotels and cheap properties. It's a domino effect that naturally occurs when supply outstrips demand.

A secondary key indicator would be that with higher airfares, there will be fewer affluent long-

haul business travelers and greater dependency on lowerrate paying, short-haul and domestic visitors.

Considering these factors looking at the long term, while keeping in mind Phuket's tourism infrastructure, world-class re-

sorts and easy access to key rency depreciation means greater long-term gain is a key advantage, as history has shown.

One of Thailand's greatest strengths in tourism is its quality hotels and value for money for tourists.

With continuing depreciation of the baht against major currencies, pent-up demand will focus on the most attractive markets during an upswing, which is a compelling advantage for tourism here.

Given that a wider diversification of residential pool villas is expected, condo hotels and managed properties will start eating into the traditional hotel market. The increasing trend towards direct Internet bookings is also leveling the playing field between internationally branded properties and independents.

With its interdependency on tourism, the property market is posed to develop into a more mature industry. The mixed-use formula currently used by many developers to fund or capitalize on hotel-managed properties is already starting to see some cracks in the silver lining and guaranteed returns on capital for such projects may be at risk if tourism numbers decline.

The growth in resales, which is becoming a major segment in transactions, is a given at this juncture. This growth displaces a portion of new sales or off-the-plan purchases.

With rising construction costs and a slowdown in sales demand, delays in large-scale projects are being incurred and a number of new buyers view completed projects as carrying less investment risk.

These conditions point to a supply surplus and most probably a flattening of prices, with some segments even experiencing short-term declining values.

With strong market fundamentals, the lack of domestic buyers leveraging real estate and most buyers having the necessary liquidity, we appear to be headed for a soft landing - unlike other markets.

Investment horizons for property vary and most buyers take a long-term view.

Phuket has already survived long, drawn-out recovery from the 1997 Asian Crisis and shown

> shorter recovery times through Sars, the tsunami and the 2006 coup.

> Owners in the market today should set their sights on the longterm, but there remains every reason to believe the Phuket market basics remain sound.

As for potential new buyers, cur-

feeder markets, Phuket's ability buying power with dollars or euto weather short-term pain for ros, and there are more products to choose from new developments and resales.

We can't ignore the world around us, but buying opportunities arise during recessions.

The bears may be behind every tree in the forest, but keep an ear to the ground for the sound of hoofs thundering down the track as the bulls return.
