Police seize weapons cache on luxury yacht

AO MAKHAM: A man has been arrested by Phuket Marine Police officers after the discovery of several guns and ammunition stashed aboard the luxury yacht he was operating.

The arrest came after Thalang district volunteer police saw people disembarking from the multi-level boat carrying guns and informed the marine police what they had seen.

When police boarded the Thai-registered yacht Meditation at Phuket Marine Customs Pier, Ao Makham, they discovered a high-powered rifle with a telescopic sight, an automatic pistol, a sub-machine gun and several cases of ammunition, including about 100 M16 rounds, 233 rounds of 11mm bullets and 180 rounds of 9mm bullets.

During their search of the vessel, police also discovered a receipt from Kathu Shooting Range for the purchase of 150 9mm bullets and a collection of

paper targets. They did not, however, find any documents pertaining to ownership of the weapons or anything to prove that the guns were registered.

The yacht's operator, 46year-old Permsin Petsawas, was questioned by police, but denied having anything to do with the weapons. He told police that they belonged to a friend of the yacht owner, whose name police would not reveal.

Police have charged the

suspect with possessing weapons and ammunition without a licence and will investigatehis claim that the weapons belong to someone else.

Permsin has also been charged for operating the boat without holding a valid captain's licence and for the vessel's registration certificate being out of

Meditation is a Thai-made boat comprising four levels. The yacht measures 37 meters in length and, according to police, was being rented out as a char-

Investigating Marine Police officer Deputy Superintendent Pol Lt Col Prasert Srikunrat said the yacht's owner is French national Pascal Wu, who has already presented himself to police.

"However, we must first investigate Preecha's claim that the weapons belong to a third party and confirm whether or not that person is legally entitled to possess the weapons seized," he added.

Police seize almost 3,000 ya bah pills in drug bust

PHUKET CITY: Provincial Police on the afternoon of August 9 arrested four men for possession of almost 3,000 *ya bah* (methamphetamine) pills with intent to sell.

One of the suspects told the police he had ordered the drugs by mobile phone from his father, an inmate at Klong Prem Central Prison in Bangkok serving time on *ya bah* charges.

Phuket City Police Investigator Pol Lt Salan Reedeng identified the four suspects as 27-year-old Mana Tiamjittaraksa of Bangkok, Phattalung natives Prajuab Kaewkong, 28, and Charnwit Yodchum, 25, along with Arthit Yuokthong of Suphanburi, age 27.

All four men were arrested at around 1 pm following a search of their rented rooms at the Sun West Apartments on Phun Pol Rd in Phuket City.

The raid was led by Pol Lt Col Theeranat Ketmee of the Phuket Provincial Police drug suppression unit, Lt Salan said.

Mana and his friends had been renting out apartments 305, 309 and 407 at the apartment block as a place to sell the narcotics, keeping most of their stash hidden away at a house on Soi Tapakhao, off Sakdidet Rd in Tambon Wichit, he added.

Some of the seized pills were recovered following a search at that location, he said.

"Mana ordered 4,000 *ya bah* pills from Bangkok by calling his father Thavorn Tiamjittaraksa, an inmate at Klong Prem Central Prison, who arranged for the order to be sent to Phuket by bus," he said.

Upon arrest all four men confessed to selling the drugs, but later denied the charges and said they will fight them in court, he said.

Resort chills out with renewable energy

KOH YAO: Installation of a biomass system as an alternative energy source began on August 13 at Evason Phuket and is set to be operational by August 25.

According to the resort, the new bio-mass furnace is the first to be installed at a resort in Asia. Once complete, the energy system will be able to run a 20-ton absorption chiller air-conditioning unit to service storage areas at the resort by burning up to 140 kilograms of organic rubbish per day.

Area Environment Conscience representative for the resort Arnfinn Oines said that garden waste will be burned in a furnace connected to an absorption chiller, which converts heat into steam to drive a turbine and power air-conditioning.

"We use garden waste from dead plants or trimmed trees to fuel the furnace, which is a carbon neutral renewable energy source. This is part of our initiative to become a resort with carbon neutral status," he explained.

Phuket celebrates Mothers' Day

CAPE PANWA: More than 300 baby green sea turtles were released into the sea at the Third Naval Area Command, Cape Panwa, on August 12 as a way of celebrating the birthday of HM Queen Sirikit, which is also Mothers' Day in Thailand.

Students from schools in the Panwa area helped naval officers, municipality officers and staff from local resorts to release 337 turtles that had been raised at the Turtle Preservation Center of the Third Area Naval Command in an attempt to re-establish dwindling turtle populations in the region.

The turtle release was led by Admiral Supot Prueksa of the Third Naval Command and began at 10 am with a ceremony to honor Queen Sirikit.

Elsewhere, in a gesture of Mothers' Day goodwill, staff at the Bel Air Panwa Resort gave deserving children from the Duang Prateep Foundation in Bangkok a taste of luxury living with a day and night's stay at the resort's high-end suites on August 11 to 12.

On August 11, staff at the resort put on an afternoon of fun activities for 54 kids from the foundation, including a splash about in the resort's pool, and then took the children to experience a performance at Phuket Fantasea.

The children spent the night at the resort and were filled with a sumptuous five-star breakfast the next day.


The victim, a female tourist from Hong Kong, was vacationing with her family on Koh Yao Noi and was swimming near one of the beaches when she was stung.

clear for floating dock

PHUKET CITY: The provincial committee on waterways has approved a request by Best Western Premier Supalai Resort & Spa in Pa Khlok to construct a 200-meter floating dock to give resort guests access to the sea.

The committee, chaired by Phuket Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima, met at Phuket Provincial Hall on August 7 to discuss the license application.

Its members include representatives from provincial offices of Public Works and Planning, Fisheries, Marine Transport, Natural Resources and Environment.

Nalinee Thongtham of the Phuket Marine Biological Center was the only committee member to express reservations about the 2m-wide plastic pier, which the resort says in only intended for swimmers and not as a berthing site for watercraft.

Worrying about the effect on coral in the area, Khun Nalinee asked the committee if the length of the dock could be limited to 150

She noted that local people had protested other pier projects in the Ao Por area.

In the end, the committee approved the 200m construction in

Supalai Resort General Manager Chokdee Chunpoon said that the dock has already been built and that the resort is still waiting for all the documents to be formally processed and signed by the gover-- By Natcha Yuttaworawit nor before beginning installation.

Funeral ceremony held for former servicemen

RAWAI: Friends of Australian Jason Gerrard Flynn and James Plunkett Howe from the UK, whose bodies were discovered at a guesthouse in Rawai on July 28, attended a Buddhist funeral ceremony for both men on August 10 at Wat Sawang Arom temple in Rawai.

The ex-servicemen were in their early 30s. They died unexpectedly overnight from suspected drug overdoses, after celebrating during their last few days of R&R together before returning to Iraq, where they had been working for a security company.

Friends attending the joint funeral expressed their disappointment at the negative media coverage of the circumstances surrounding the men's deaths and requested that their families now be allowed to mourn in peace.

Turtle given fighting chance


CAPE PANWA: An immature Olive Ridley sea turtle whose badly infected front left flipper had to be amputated by veterinarians at the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC) in early June is recovering well at the center,.

Named Hope by members of the Mai Khao Sea Turtle Foundation that rescued the turtle, the 13-kilogram turtle is thought to be about 10 years old.

Whether or not Hope is a male or female has yet to be determined. PMBC veterinarian Sontaya Manawattana said he suspects Hope is a female, but that it is still too early to say for sure.

Found washed up on Mai Khao Beach last month, Hope is having trouble relearning how to swim with just three flippers.

"We would say the odds for her to be able to swim normally and be released is fifty-fifty. We will know the outcome in a few months," K. Sontaya said.



Best Western given all Police bust bikini shop for secret B10m counterfeit-T-shirt stash

PHUKET CITY: A bikini is normally donned to cover up a woman's private parts, but a bikini-vending operation in downtown Phuket was found concealing something of a different kind of value: a stash of more than 90,000 counterfeit T-shirts that were seized by police over the weekend.

Officers from the Police Region 8 Investigation Center raided a secret warehouse in the center of Phuket City Saturday afternoon, seizing more than 10 million baht in counterfeit designer goods, police said.

Police Region 8 Investigations Inspector Lt Col Witsanu Chamroonroj, who led the raid, said the discovery of the warehouse followed an investigation into the illegal sale of knock-off CDs, DVDs, baseball caps and similar items on the island.

At about 5 pm, officers presented a search warrant to the female manager of a shop selling bikinis on Montri Rd Phuket City.

The operation was apparently just a front, as a subsequent search of some five three-story shophouses connected to it uncovered 90,503 counterfeit items, mostly T-shirts, bearing such well-known labels as Lacoste,



These shophouse units were allegedly used as a base to resupply vendors across the island with counterfeit designer-label goods. Police put the value of the T-shirts seized at about 100 baht each.

Adidas, Nike, Diesel and Polo.

Police arrested the woman, who told them she had been employed by the owner to look after the goods.

She identified the owner only as "Hia Moo" (Brother Moo), whose name indicates he is a wealthy man of ethnic Chinese descent. Soon after the raid, top local police officers were at

Kusoldharm Foundation workers were called in to assist in moving the garments to the Phuket Provincial Police Special Operations Unit storeroom in Phuket City.

The suspect was taken for questioning to Phuket City Police Station. She was charged with the sale of counterfeit goods and released on 400,000 baht bail the following day, he said.

Lt Col Witsanu said he intends to liaise with Pol Maj Nanon Pitakkulthon of the Phuket City Police who is now in charge of finding out the whereabouts of the mysterious Hia Moo.

Patrols help reduce illegal trawling

PHUKET CITY: The number of fishing boats illegally trawling within Phuket's three-kilometer exclusion zone has been greatly reduced thanks to stepped up patrols by authorities and good co-operation from local fishermen, the local Department of Marine and Coastal Resources (DMCR) office has announced.

Paitoon Panchaiyapoom, chief of the DMCR Region 4 Office in Phuket, said there have been just three arrests for trawling within the exclusion zone since nightly patrols by DMCR officers began at the beginning of 2008.

'We still get complaints from the local fishermen at Bangtao and Maikhao beaches that there is still some illegal fishing going on, but there are no reports of trawling further south along Patong and Karon-Kata beaches thanks to the good co-operation between locals there and DMCR officers," he

Most of the violators are from other provinces, he added. Despite the sharp decrease in illegal trawling, the DMCR will continue its patrols, he said.





Labor pains: the life and times

routine visit to Phuket's Immigration Detention Center (IDC) prompted Gazette Chief Reporter Akbar Khan to dig deeper into the issue of human trafficking and how the construction of some of the island's luxury developments may be causing suffering in the camps of the workers who build them. Islanders living near these septic sites may also find themselves unwittingly affected by the camps' unhygienic conditions.

Saphan Hin the *Ga*zette saw more than a full house of detainees waiting to be processed for deportation.

There were 133 young males packed into two small confinement areas and around 60 older men, women and children bringing the total number of illegal immigrants held at one time to almost 200.

The detention of so many illegal immigrants followed comments made by Immigration Commissioner Lt Gen Chatchawan Suksomchit when he spoke to the Gazette on July 29.

"I do not deny the fact that

t the Phuket IDC in the integrity of government officials across the board must now be more closely monitored and action taken against those involved," he said, adding that immigration laws would in future be strictly enforced.

Judging by the sudden influx of illegal aliens at the IDC, it was clear that someone was getting serious about the issue.

Pol Maj Neti Khanbun who heads interrogations, investigations and inspections of illegal aliens in Phuket allowed the Gazette into the center to meet the detainees. However, he asked the Gazette not to take pictures inside the two small cells holding 133 young Burmese men but did allow photo-



graphs of other detainees who were held outside the cells.

Speaking to the Burmese

laborers the Gazette discovered that 80 of them were laborers that had been arrested at their camp adjacent to the West Sands construction site where they said they had worked. The arrests were reported in the Gazette's online news on August 7.

"They came at 5 am and took us away. We did not have a chance to collect our belongings and now we hear from visitors that there are people going into our rooms and looting our possessions," said one of the detained Burmese men.

One woman said that living at the camp was a nightmare. "I could not save any money with all the extra 'fees' that I had to pay the contractor. I was told that I was legally employed but that my documents were held by my

boss," she said.
"Why am I smiling now? Because now my dream has come true. Someone will take me from that camp and help me get back to my motherland with my undocumented baby that was born here," she added.

"It's always the same," said another. "We save a little money, our compatriots are arrested and we are supposed to help bail them out."

"I don't want anyone to pay for me to escape from the police and go back to the camp," another detainee said. "I would rather go back to my country and have real freedom."

Upon inquiring about the cramped, smelly cells that they

were now inhabiting the general consensus was that conditions there were no worse than at the camp.

"This is like paradise compared to the labor camp we lived at," said one. "Even the food that immigration feeds us is better than what we had to eat at the camp," said another.

The initial news of the arrests was based on telephone interviews done with government officials.

In an earlier interview, Thalang District Chief of Internal Security, Palad Thammarong Chuay-Aksorn, told the *Gazette* that he'd learned about the large number of Burmese workers at the camp near the Mai Khao beachfront from nearby villagers.

"We don't know who they are working for. I went there with about 40 Thalang District officers in my team as well as some village volunteers and police officers from Tah Chat Chai Po-



lice Station. About 50 people worked on these arrests. We arrested all 82 Burmese before

They were doing their daily activities. No one resisted or ran away, but we could not arrest their employer because nobody saw him there," he said.

The arrested Burmese were taken from their camp and initially held at Tah Chat Chai police station.

Once immigration officers discovered that the illegal migrants were being held by local police, they transferred the aliens to Saphan Hin to be processed before being sent back to Burma.

Pol Lt Col Jamroon Plaiduong of Tah Chat Chai Police Station told the *Gazette*, "The employer has done no wrong because the workers were arrested outside of a construction site. We did not arrest them, it was the district chief and the volunteers."

Back at the camp next to the construction site at Mai Khao, the foremen at the site seemed worried about the presence of the *Gazette*.

They explained that the Burmese did not work for them directly but for a sub-contractor. The camp for Burmese laborers is adjacent to the building site and

separate from the tin shacks where Thai laborers are living.

There were Burmese workers remaining in the camp. Some of them had documents issued and stamped by the Department of Labor stating the worker's and employer's name, whilst others said that their bosses claimed to be looking after all the necessary documents for them.

Those still at the camp confirmed that the raid in fact took place at around 4 am.

They were bitter that they had paid all the "fees" collected by their Thai employer to "take care" of them.

Looking around the camp,

there were festering cesspools behind the latrines; perfect breeding grounds for disease-carrying mosquitoes. Different types of hemorrhagic fever are carried from Burma by many of these immigrants and the mosquitoes then help to spread it around neighboring communities.

The workers showed evidence that they had paid their agents for "health insurance" as well as other fees. However, some of them looked far from healthy.

Although the police said they did not know which contractors were responsible for the illegal migrant workers who were arrested at the camp, the *Gazette* was able to obtain the phone number of one of the contractors. When asked to comment on the arrests, the contractor replied, "We don't want to talk to the media....And how did you get my number anyway?"

When we buy our coffee from Starbucks we get a guarantee that the farmers were treated well and paid fairly.

Why, when we buy a home don't we ask, was it built by Burmese laborers who have been severely exploited to the point that their dream is to be picked up and deported?

The 133 men in the cells were Burmese, 80 of them from the camp by the West Sands construction site, the other 60 living in the center but outside the cells were Burmese, Lao and Cambodian.

As there are many agents and sub-agents involved in the development of large building projects, the companies that eventually operate the developments when complete may not have any knowledge of the working and living conditions of the construction workers.

However, this does not change the fact that wealthy foreigners buying these luxury homes are inadvertently helping to support the trafficking and exploitation of migrant workers.

Sugar daddies' pockets hit by phantom pregnancies

ttractive women having relationships with much older and considerably less attractive men for financial benefit is certainly nothing new.

In Isarn, however, some girls have allegedly started using an ingenious method to extract more money from their stingy sugar daddies: having their stomachs injected with chemicals to make them appear pregnant.

Pukki, a 20-year-old college student from Ubon Ratchathani, said some students were using this method to get extra money

from businessmen or government officers they have relationships

Usually the sugar daddies would give them pocket money of only 300 to 500 baht a month, which is hardly enough for a modern girl these days,

Friends studying in Maha Sarakham province, one of the main student centers of the northeast, had told her that certain clinics would inject chemicals into girls' stomachs that would make them swell up as if they were pregnant, Pukki said.

Phuket Animation Festival

This method worked especially well with men who were well known in society, particularly high-ranking officials. When the girls say they are pregnant. almost all of the men are happy to give them as much money as they need for an illegal abortion, she said.

Most of the men want the problem to disappear out of fear that their wives will find out and because of the future costs of having to support an illegitimate child, Pukki explained.

Another Übon Rachathani college student, 21-year-old "Em", said that while she had heard of many cases of girls claiming they were pregnant to extort money from their sugar daddies, she had yet to hear of anyone using chemicals to inflate their stomachs.


Em explained that girls' sponsors would often give excuses and use delaying tactics when the girls asked for money to buy essentials, such as motorbikes, cars and brand-name fashion accessories.

Falsely claiming pregnancy is the surest way to get what you want and students have learned the sure-fire method from TV soap operas, she added.

Dr Wutikrai Mungmai, a doctor with Ubon Ratchathani Provincial Health Department, said that he had not as yet come across the practice of faking pregnancies through stomach injections.

He had, however, heard of a number of clinics offering abortions. These would be cracked down on very soon, he said.

Thailand Post is celebrating its 125th anniversary with these new stamps detailing some of Thailand's long-forgotten

Thai Post rolls out currency collection

hailand Post recently celebrated its 125th anniversary with an event from August 1 to 10 at the Queen Sirikit National Convention Center in Bangkok, when a new set of stamps with a monetary twist was unveiled to the public.

The new set is all about solos – the currency used in Thailand during the era of King Rama V. One solos is the equivalent of 1/128 baht by today's standards.

There are five designs in this collection. The first stamp shows 1 baht, equal to 2 solos. The stamp was printed in such a way as to imitate the very first stamps printed by Thailand

The second design features 1 siew, equal to 2 baht. On the third stamp you can see 1 sek, equal to 2 siew.

These three stamps are available for the equivalent of 384 solos, or 3 baht to you and me.

One stamp priced at 10 baht features 1 saleung. In Thailand, 25 satang used to be known as 1 saleung.

A stamp printed using holographic techniques shows another image of 1 solos and can be yours for 25 baht.

Each stamp was printed using a stochastic screen technique, which creates images using very fine, small pixels.

The stamps measure 30 by 49 millimeters and one million of each has been printed.

Thailand Post's Udorn Niyomtham did the design work and Gather Security Printing Co Ltd in France printed the stamps.

A five-stamp set, complete with two commemorative envelopes, is available for 70 baht.

All 10 of Phuket's post offices have stocked the stamps since August 1.

Conference call on copycat killing

ollowing the stabbing murder of a Bangkok cab driver by a school-boy acting out a scene from a violent video game, the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) will host a conference on what to do about violent video games popular with young people.

After his parents refused to give him money to buy the latest version of the video game Grand Theft Auto, 19-year-old schoolboy Phalawat Chinno on August 9 decided to rob a cab driver.

In the space of eight hours, Phalawat calmly purchased two knives then went and selected his victim, 54-year-old Khuan Phokaeng, because he was "old and less strong".

Phalawat said the the murder was a robbery gone wrong, claiming Khuan fought back, hitting him with a wrench when he produced a knife and demanded cash.

When the driver sounded the horn and then tried to flee on foot, Phalawat continued the assault. After the fatally wounded driver collapsed, Phalawat dragged his body into the back seat and tried to drive off.

Although he couldn't drive, the boy thought making off with the taxi would be a cinch, based on his game-playing experiences.

Saying "killing is not a difficult thing to do", Phalawat admitted to police he got the idea for the robbery from the Grand Theft Auto series of video games.

Following the incident, the company that distributes Grand Theft Auto IV in Thailand ordered sales of the game to be halted.

Cyber Force. The DSI is also recruiting youths to help detect cyber crimes. DSI official Lt Col Pattana Sukornsut said the agency had approached youngsters via its Cyber Force project, which shows Internet dangers, how to protect oneself and how to help others through training. The project has already trained more than 2,000 students from 20 schools.

Sinking feeling. Thirteen townhouses in Nonthaburi's Bang Bua Thong district suddenly subsided on the morning of August 4, prompting residents to hurriedly move belongings and run for safety.

Municipality officials put up a "No Entry" sign to prevent people from getting hurt from further subsidence.

The estate headman discussed with the affected residents the possibility of demanding compensations from the estate developer, who paid out 300,000 baht per home to 13 homeowners following a similar incident in 2004.

The estate was passed on from the original owner, a bankrupt businessman, to Sin Asia Co and later Bangkok Commercial Asset Management Co Ltd.

Strong ties. Despite ongoing economic woes, a survey has found that most people say they can adjust to the problems they encounter.

Of 4,478 respondents polled by Mahidol University research center, some 57% say their family ties have remained the same throughout the slowdown while 39% claim they have actually improved. Only 4% say their family ties have worsened.

Some 39% say they are fully financially independent, while 55% put their financial independence at a "medium" level. The rest are struggling.

According to the survey, rural people have a greater ability to adjust to the economic slowdown than their urban counterparts.

Conspicuous consumption. A recent study by the University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce (UTCC) has found the government's "Million Baht Village Fund" has only increased consumption among villagers.

Academics, including

UTCC Assistant Professor Sauwanee Thairungroj, said it would be better if policy makers worked on teaching people how to save and invest rather than providing them with handouts.

Policy makers should also address the problem of people defaulting on credit, the study also showed.

Conducted between 1997 and 2003, the survey was based on data collected from 960 households in 64 villages spread over four provinces: Chachoengsao, Lopburi, Srisaket and Buri Ram.

Dengue disaster. The Rayong provincial administration announced that the province is a dengue disaster zone, with 1,397 people infected with dengue and two dead from the disease so far this year.

Rayong deputy governor Siripong Hantrakul said declaring a disaster zone allowed the provincial administration to spend its emergency fund of 50-millionbaht to fight the dengue spread. Rayong, which borders Burma and is home to a large illegal alien population, remains on top of the provinces with the highest incidence of the disease.

Hub dreams. The Public Health Ministry is targeting 2 million foreign patients and annual medical receipts of 80 billion baht from abroad by 2010.

To achieve the target, the ministry has drawn up its strategy to promote Thailand as a medical service hub to the international community, said Health Services Support Department Director Dr Supachai Kunarattanapruk.

The strategy includes continual improvement of services and infrastructure as well as introduction of "one-stop service centers" to fast-track the issuance of visas, help find accommodation for foreign patients and their relatives, and develop reim-

bursement systems with health insurance agencies abroad.

The number of foreign patients increased from 630,000 in 2004 to 1.5 million in 2007. Revenue from this segment also grew, from 16 billion baht in 2004 to 40 billion last year.

Private hospitals have mostly enjoyed an increasing flow of patients from Japan, the US, Europe, China and the United Arab Emirates.

Rural reality. Thirty public community hospitals have only one doctor each, one fewer than the minimum two required to take care of 30 in-patients, a senior medical official said.

Doctor Itthipol Khanacharoen, assistant secretary-general of the Medical Council, said the 30 hospitals were in provinces including Nan, Trat, Loei, Samut Songkram and Chanthaburi.

Dr Itthipol was speaking during a seminar of 250 medical personnel from both private and public hospitals.

Opening ceremony. Five people were injured, three severely, when a set of fireworks exploded prematurely on the morning of August 9 in Nonthaburi.

The fireworks were lit at 9:30 am during the opening ceremony of a boat race on the Chao Phya River in Nonthaburi's Muang district. The organizer of the race lit the fireworks and nine of them flew up to explode in the sky, but the last exploded inside the metal pipe used to fire it.

Five audience members were injured by the shrapnel and rushed to the Krung Siam St Carlos Hospital, police said.

Suffering from chicken and egg

ost of Koh Lanta's mom-and-pop businesses have the art of working down pat. They work like mad for half a year during the high season (November to April), then relax for the next six months and plan how to make more money during the next high season.

However, this practice doesn't help low-season tourism on the island, especially for large hotel groups that need to stay open – if only to retain their staff for the coming high season.

It's a classic chicken-andegg situation on Lanta; businesses don't stay open in green season because there are no tourists and tourists don't come to Lanta because the island has a closeddown feeling.

The problem is complex, according to one the island's top hotel managers, but the core causes – dirty beaches, closed businesses and poor low-season promotion – have existed for almost a decade.

"Having been here for eight years, I can say very little has changed," said Franck de Lestapis, general manager of Pimalai Resort and Spa. "It's a shame, because green season is wonderful on Koh Lanta and businesses like Pimalai need to operate as an all-year-round destination, but we can't exist in isolation," he added.

Pimalai is situated at Kantiang Bay, at the far south end of the island, where the beach is cleaned daily and businesses are open in low season. The beach also has the benefit of being in a protected bay so the majority of the monsoon garbage flows past without entering the bay. On the island's other nine beaches, some hotels clean the beach area immediately in front of their own resorts, but are still surrounded by their neighbors' garbage.

"Every year during low season, we remind our beach neighbors how important it is to keep the beach clean and to keep businesses open," said Mr de Lestapis. "I believe the entire beach has benefited from this, so why not make it an island-wide program and promote that fact?" he

Also compounding the problem is the negative feedback tour-

ists in Ao Nang and Phi Phi receive when inquiring about going to Koh Lanta in the low season. Ao Nang and Phi Phi compete against Lanta to fill their own rooms and boats in low season.

"The island is closed until November," said one travel agent when I inquired about a room on

Lanta Old Town, the cultural heart of Koh Lanta and a historically important harbor and trading post, is becoming a popular destination for Andaman Sea travelers. When the fishing village was officially registered as a Thai town 150 years ago, it was a busy sea port with large junk ships registering with Thai Customs as they entered Thai wa-

ters from ports in Malaysia, Singapore and China.

Lanta Marine Services is now helping the local government to install and manage 50 new moorings,

three of which have already been set and are occupied. The company will also offer marine support services for short-stay visitors and for long-stay yacht stor-

The project also involves

creating ways to help local fishermen and small island communities from surrounding islands access Koh Lanta in a safer and more efficient manner. Currently, Lanta Marine Service is looking at ways to build loading docks next to the main cement pier to soften the impact on the wooden longtails and to make it easy to offload passengers.

Graeme Belshaw, managing director of Lanta Marine Service, has been sailing in the area for nine years and lived on his yacht in Phuket, Langkawi and Penang before making Lanta his home. He approached the local authorities last year about starting the project to assure the added marine activity takes on an eco-

> friendly approach. "This is a wonderfully safe harbor with a surrounding infrastructure to support a secure mooring area," commented Mr Belshaw.

"We'd like to help it develop in a sustainable manner," he added.

New shuttle service. Locals are happy to hear about the new transportation option for tourists in Phuket traveling to Lanta. The new direct minibus was started a few months back by Southern Transport, a respected VIP bus operator

Any private transport initiative like this is welcome as local tourist authorities seem determined to undermine Lanta hotel operators, who have some 4,000 rooms to fill every day.

Last high season, in a move that defies all logic, one of the two daily passenger ferry boats from Krabi Town was canceled, putting an added strain on the already weak car-ferry link from the Krabi mainland to Koh Lanta.

The inexpensive (213 baht) shuttle between Lanta and Phuket leaves daily every hour from the main bus station in Phuket City between 7:30 am and 2:30pm, and from their Klong Dao depot on Lanta between 6:30 am and

Travelers must find their own way to these departing locations because the minivans are not permitted to pick up guests from other locations. Reservations can be made by calling 075-684408 or 080-1449549.

nternational media rights group Reporters Without Borders has issued a statement condemning the killing of Athiwat Chainurat, the Nakhon Sri Thammarat correspondent for Matichon newspaper who was shot dead in his home

In the statement, released August 4, the group said that it was "outraged" by the murder and added: "We call on the competent authorities to act quickly with the aim of shedding full light on this murder and bringing those responsible to justice. It is vital that the investigation should concentrate on those who masterminded this clearly premeditated killing."

Meanwhile, Region 8 Police Commisoner Lt Gen Thani Tawitsri, a personal friend of K. Athiwat, said that the case was progressing well. Gen Thani said that before his death, K. Athiwat told him about some people who he believed wanted to kill him for his reporting, and police were following up these leads.

Gen Thani added that the gun used in the killing, a .32 caliber pistol, and the method of the attack indicated that the killers were not professionals as that type of weapon was very rarely used by professional killers.

Deadly gunfight. A Tambon council member was shot dead and a wanted assassin seriously injured in a shootout outside the councilman's house in Nakhon Sri Thammarat's Thung Song District August 5.

Witnesses reported that as Somkiat Ratanaburi, 35, was about to go into his house after returning from a neighbor's wedding in the early hours of the morning, a man stepped out of the shadows and shot him in the chest with a shotgun.

The gunman then walked up to K. Somkiat who was lying injured. Somkiat drew his 11mm pistol and fired seven shots at his attacker, who turned and fled.

Neighbors rushed K. Somkiat to Thung Song Hospital, but he died on route.

Thamanoon Faiju, Superintendent of Thung Song Police Station, received a report from a villager of a large pool of blood next to a rubber plantation near K. Somkiat's house. Col Thamanoon led a team of officers to the spot, and in the plantation found an injured man hiding.

Rights group slams journalist's murder

On seeing the police, the man opened fire with a pistol and a gunfight ensued. No one was hit in the exchange, and when the shooting stopped officers managed to subdue the man, later identified as Charoen Suankul,

Police took Charoen to Thung Song Hospital to be treated for multiple gunshot wounds from K. Somkiat's 11mm pistol.

Col Thamanoon said that Charoen was a Forestry Department employee responsible for preventing encroachment on forest land in Krabi's Khlong Thom District. Apart from this, he was also a gunman near the top of the wanted lists of election on September 8 this year. Despite this, police said that they believe a personal dispute and not local politics is likely to have provided a motive for the attack as all the people standing in the election against K. Somkiat were his relatives.

Ambitious plans. The mayor of Satun Town has announced plans to spend 403 million baht improving tourist infrastructure in the town, including building a 70-million-baht planetarium.

Mayor Phibun Rachakijaprakan said that in budget year 2009, he would request a 50-million-baht budget from the Local Administration Department to road connecting them.

and would like to build one in Satun so that local students and school children would have a chance to improve their knowledge of the night sky.

The proposed developments are part of a three-year plan to encourage tourism in the town, which will be complete by the time his term ends in four years, Mayor Phibun said.

Dirty business? A Nakhon Sri Thammarat traffic police squad leader has been ordered to an inactive post after a leaflet campaign in the city accused him and his squad of corruption and called for a public demonstration to demand his dismissal.

On August 3, Commander of Nakhon Sri Thammarat Provincial Police Major General Krajang Suranarat issued an order for Senior Sergent Major Arun Tobai, a Traffic Squad Leader at Muang Police Station, to be transferred to an inactive post at Thamphanra Police Station for 180 days with immediate

The order came after in the preceding few days, leaflets appeared in the city accusing Sgt Maj Arun and his squad of taking bribes and "inhumane and merciless" enforcement of the law, as well as using foul and abusive language when dealing with the public. The leaflets called for people to join a demonstration outside the provincial governor's residence at 10 am on August 3 to drive out the officer. The would-be demonstrators were, however, pre-empted by Gen Krajang's order.

Sgt Maj Arun said on August 3 that he had received the order and would report to his new posting that day. He denied all the allegations against him saying that he had always enforced the law strictly but honestly and blamed the campaign against him on groups who may have lost out because of his application of the law, especially the leaders of some groups of motorcycle taxi drivers.

Sticking it to the locals

amboo tubes crammed with sweet sticky rice, known as khao larm, are a treat seen at temple fairs and fresh markets all over Thailand.

Much more than a simple snack, however, khao larm is a handmade creation borne out of the hard work of three generations, where community and tradition are bound together in a neat little package.

Several hours before dawn breaks on the island, a number of villagers in Soi Hin Rui, on a little corner behind Thalang Hospital, rise and begin preparing a fire with wood placed along a narrow strip on the ground.

Sticky rice, which has been soaked in water for about five hours the night before, is stuffed into dozens of bamboo tubes.

Coconut milk, sugar and salt are added, then the tubes are sealed with a stopper made with coconut shell covered by banana leaf.

The tubes are placed upright on a rack that runs alongside the stretch of low-burning fire, where they are left to be heated by the smoke and flames for 90 minutes.

Once cooked, the tubes are taken from the rack, and the blackened outside of the bamboo is shaved off with a machete. The freshly exposed bamboo is then smoothed and cleaned by hand.

Each tube is stamped with "Khao Larm Hin Rui" to mark where they were made. By 8 am, all the tubes are loaded up onto the back of a motorbike and delivered to markets and shops around the island.

In the past, 17 families in

the village were involved in the production of khao larm. Villager U-sa "Dang" Intaraseni, 40, said, "Now there are only seven families left in the village who still cook khao larm and I know this occupation will be finished soon because the younger generation is not interested in doing it.

"But I will go on doing it until I lose my strength," he added.

Fellow khao larm maker Wilaiporn Ratchapon, 32, said, "I've been cooking khao larm since I was young and my mother told me that we are the third generation to do it. Now the economy has changed and production costs are higher.

"We cook 20 kilograms of sticky rice per day. About 10kg of sticky rice is mixed with 4kg of coconut milk, 250 grams of salt


and 1.5kg of sugar. Including the bamboo that we buy from Phang Nga or sometimes Surat Thani, the daily cost is about 1,300 baht. And then we also have to pay for transportation and workers," she said.

The selling price of the snack depends on the width of the bamboo tube, but K. Wilaiporn explained that a bunch containing five or six thin tubes is 50 baht. The current best seller is black sticky rice, she said, whereas in the past white rice was more popular.

Hin Rui sticky rice is now promoted with the help of Thepkrasattri Municipality, under the "One Tambon, One Product" community development initiative. The "Khao Larm Hin Rui" stamp has now become a source of pride for the village and it ensures that those indulging in the sweet snack will come to know the distinctive taste of the Hin Rui product.

In a world where everything, especially food, is turning into a bland, machine-made commodity, it is hoped that these seven families will stick it out with their efforts in making the island a sweeter place to live.

Those interested in seeing khao larm being made are welcome to call Thepkrasattri Municipality at 076-311378 from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday. Be prepared to get up early, however, since the families usually start cooking at about 2 am.

Far from losing her head in the clouds at the top of her towering frame, Burbridge managed to keep her feet on the ground, sharing an outlook on life with her husband that appreciates the nature of celebrity.

"I always had a good head on my shoulders. If I partied and

went out, I always pulled straight As at school so my parents couldn't get upset with me. I was a smart partyer," she said.

Bishop added, "Being in the entertainment business is one of those things where your work is your play. The thing about modeling is that the work is fun. It may be difficult sometimes, but you're always around your

"If you're a new model and you don't get along with the people, then you won't get very far in the Thai industry,"

While a number of celebrities have been very vocal with regards to the recent standoff between the People's Alliance for

Democracy and the government, Burbridge has her doubts as to the motives of using star power in such a way.

"I think the celebrities that have gone to the protests," said Burbridge, "have been made examples of. I'm not saying don't stand up for what you feel, but if one day something happens and I feel that strongly about it then I'll make that decision then. focus more on my charities."

The charity that Burbridge and Bishop devote most of their time to is the Camillian Social Center (www.camillian-rayong. org), a home for about 50 children born with HIV/Aids.

"The center is in Rayong and we have been running it for more than 10 years now. We started out more visiting and going and seeing the kids, but as the years have gone by we've done quite a few fundraisers and activities," said Burbridge.

"I think it's very unfair for

a man to go out and contract Aids and then give it to his wife and pass it onto a child," added the supermodel.

Bishop shares his wife's outlook on celebrity when it comes to the center. "Maybe it's purely selfish of us," he said, "because we see the children and get something out of it just being able to make them happy.

"We feel as if they have never had a chance to experience the simple things and we take them on excursions and trips to the beach and other places," added Bishop.

"We recently held a big gala dinner in Bangkok and raised 1.5 million baht," said Burbridge. "We did it with the Italian chamber of Commerce. I organized an auction of designer dresses."

"Whatever you choose to do isn't important," said Bishop. "If you have celebrity it's a tool and because of that, we are connected with a lot of people who are able to do things.

"If you have the Italian Chamber of Commerce, that's an institution, which compared with the individual is so much more. But then as an individual, if you have celebrity then you're able to connect with these institutions and network and bring people together – and then you can do something big.

"We've seen the center grow from one little center to something much larger with a much wider scope and we're just blown away by it," he added.

Burbridge added, "Obviously with the fame you get a lot of perks, but you have a responsibility as well, so why not use that – and I know it sounds really cliché – to make a difference. You can either choose to be a role model or you can choose to waste it."


Looking to the future, Burbridge said she hopes to star in another movie should the right script be presented.

A stroll along the boulevard of the sea

Rhao Rang – done that. Laem Singh Beach – been there every Sunday. An Indonesian boat that looks like an oversized wooden toy? Ahoy there! If you're looking for somewhere new to watch the sun set, this could be just the thing: a 28-meter wooden boat that wouldn't look out of place stuffed into an enormous whiskey bottle.

The *Bleu Blanc* has space and cushions for 30 people to loll about on deck while the vessel drifts out over the sea, giving seafarers a chance to see Phuket from a different angle. Captain Julien, 25, a Frenchman, is in charge of the vessel and he's out to convince Phuket that the best sunsets are to be viewed out at sea.

While the boat looks as if the blue sails should be hung from the 4.8m masts in order for it to move, the wonders of modern technology mean that the vessel can be propelled across the sea thanks to an engine. If the wind is sufficient, the sails can be raised for an authentic aquatic adventure.

People congregate at Chalong Pier at about 5 pm. Everyone then boards the boat, takes their shoes off and then the fun begins.

As the trip begins, staff serve cocktails to take the edge off a long

day. The boat takes a route from Chalong Pier around to Patong. As the boat cruises past Rawai, the engines are cut and the drifters are served dinner and drinks while the sun bids farewell for the day. As the sun sets, candles on the tables illuminate the deck and throw those on board into a slick bohemian light.

The buffet dinner presents an assortment of Thai and Western dishes, while wines, beers and all manner of fruit juices are on hand to wash it all down.

Casual melodies are provided by the in-boat band, Classic Jammed, who are familiar faces around Phuket. Expect to hear renditions of Let It Be and the Boyzone-massacred Words, originally by the Bee Gees, of course.

From then on, it's a casual cruise to Kata-Karon, onto Patong to watch the twinkle of the night-time activities in the distance before returning to dry land at Chalong at about 10:30 pm, or later if the guests are so into the cruise that they don't want to go home.

The price of a trip on the old *Bleu Blanc* is 4,900 baht per person, or 3,000 baht during low season from July until mid-November. The boat leaves from Chalong Pier at about 5 pm every Wednesday.

Tattoo protégé gives thanks to ink master

huket based skin artist Wichathorn "Bond" Sonsap, 28, started tat tooing in 2002.

He was taught the finer details of this art form by his mentor, Sid Siamese 1 - a veteran tattooist who now works from his studio in Karlstad, Sweden.

"I have been lucky to know Sid Siamese 1," said Khun Bond. "He showed me the proper techniques for tattooing. Sid took a person like me, who had no prior knowledge of art and tattooing, and he gave me the skill and appreciation that I now have. It has made me realize that this is what I was born to do.

"It's not simply tattooing; it's body art," added Khun Bond, who is part of the Siamese "family" of tattooists. Sid, who lives in Sweden, is the head of the family, while Khun Bond is Siamese 4. Four of Sid's students have gone on to join the family. Sid took Khun Bond under his wing in 2002 and the pair have never looked back since.

The Siamese family style is distinctly Asian. Although many clients request other styles, Khun Bond prefers to ink what he has been trained to do without compromising his techniques. However, if a customer is persistent and adamant about wanting him to work with a different style, Khun Bond will work harder to achieve the end results, he said.

Having an Asian artist work on Asian tattoos is enough for many of Khun Bond's customers to fly to Thailand specifically for his unique talents.

Khun Bond's work has seen him pick up a number of international accolades. While in Swe-

den, he won Best Tattoo of the Day at the Dalaslaget Tattoo 2 convention; Best Tattoo of the Show at the 2005 Wermland Tattoo Expo 3; and two awards – Best Tattoo of the Show and Best Small Tattoo – at the 2006 Wermland Tattoo Expo 4.

Clients and friends usually hang out with Khun Bond at Kroom Krim, his small tattoo studio in Soi Romanee – open from about 7 pm until 1 am.

Khun Bond juggles his time equally between his work in Phuket and his other tattoo par-

lor, Fetto Tattoo, in Borlänge, Sweden. If you want to have a piece done by Khun Bond, you have until January to seek out his services before he returns to Sweden for six months.

Most of Khun Bond's clients are Thai-Chinese, who prefer Chinese and Japanese styles, with an emphasis on curves and spiral shapes. Asian tattoos tend to focus on images of dragons, fish, Eastern devils and so on, while Western styles can cover

anything from images of buxom ladies to Harley-Davidson logos.

One of Khun Bond's customers, Khun Note, told the *Gazette* that he trusts Bond's ability and that he always works in a professional manner.

Khun Note's body has been a canvas for Khun Bond's work several times, with his upper arm covered with Oriental patterns.

Although Bond is very young, he has good skills, so I prefer him over other artists. I









he first thing that struck me about my home town was how clean, orderly and systematic everything seemed after 12 years of continuous exposure to chaos – Thai-style. Even the one-hour drive home down Massachusetts Route 24 seemed surreal.

Phuket's roads are lined with all manner of visual distractions: sleeping dogs, sidewalk vendors, old men weaving perilously on bicycles, trucks filled with invisible alien workers and layer upon layer of signs covering every possible surface.

In stark contrast, all you get on a Massachusetts highway is a generous breakdown lane and trees – lots of them. It is no wonder falling asleep at the wheel accounts for such a large percentage of the traffic accidents in the Bay State.

Compared to Phuket, there are hardly any motorcycles on the roads in Massachusets, even though there are signs put up that read, "Be careful! Motorcycles are everywhere!" In Massachusetts, they worry about non-existent problems while in Phuket we ignore real ones.

Sitting in the back seat of the car on our way to the Cape was my wide-eyed Thai wife, on her first-ever visit Stateside, and our whining and squirming two-year-old daughter. The child was less interested in the arboreal landscape outside than in finding a way out of the car seat into which she had been strapped, in compliance with Massachusetts State Law, by her grandparents.

"When did this become mandatory?" I asked them, explaining that the only safety rule we use in our beat-up Suzuki Caribbean in Phuket is that she has to sit down when the traffic light turns green.

"I don't remember, but the police here will give you a big fine if they catch her not sitting in one," they replied.

During my stay, Massachusetts raised the car-seat age from five to eight. If this trend continues maybe next time I go back I'll have to sit in one too.

As I pondered this, I could clearly imagine the scene 12 time zones away in Phuket: a family

Impressively down in the dumps

Upon his return, he was asked to reflect on how things have changed in the States over the 12 years since he last visited. One of the things he came away most impressed with was the town dump.

of five all perched precariously atop Honda Clicks and Suzuki Smashes in the rain at the Tesco-Lotus intersection, drawing not a single raised eyebrow of interest from Phuket's finest.

The gap between safety awareness in my home country and my adopted one is not only huge, but it is expanding. Another new law that came into effect in Massachusetts some time while I was away is that all vehicles traveling in both directions are required to stop as soon as a pedestrian steps off the curb onto a crosswalk – and they do.

After so many years of trying to sprint nervously across three lanes of high-speed, one-way traffic in Patong, or having to resort to the go-halfway-and-pray routines elsewhere in Phuket, I should have felt a brief sensation of how royalty must feel riding in a motorcade.

But I didn't, because as the Brits like to say, all this stopping for the pedestrian (me) really "did my head in". Even though the road looked clear as I stepped timidly off the pavement, I kept expecting a 1,000-pound weight to fall on me from out of the sky,

à la the opening scene of the old Monty Python TV show. Even after three weeks I couldn't get used to it, much in the same way I was still clinging to the sidewalks of Soi Bangla six months after they turned it into a nighttime walking street a few years ago.

The other thing that immediately struck me was how clean and litter-free the house and neighborhood I grew up in seemed after so

many years away. Where was the dust? The lizard shit? The cockroach carapaces?

Re-adjusting to a place where respect for the environ-

ment doesn't end at the front gate is certainly not easy after such a long time away.

After I quit smoking in Phuket about three years ago I developed an equally disgusting (albeit healthier) habit: chewing on plastic dental flossers. In Phuket, I thought nothing of clandestinely spitting the tiny plastic remnants onto a sidewalk or anywhere else I could get away with it – after all, plastic biodegrades though exposure to sunlight.

In my old neighborhood on Cape Cod there was literally not a trace of litter to been seen anywhere – even though the town does not employ a single street-sweeper. I would be Public Enemy #1 if caught.

Of all the places I visited during my holiday, the most impressive was what used to be the town "dump". The landfill was capped in 1999 and replaced by a nearby waste-management facility where every scrap of refuse is sorted and stored for eventual disposal elsewhere.

The same place I remembered as a smelly, seagull-infested expanse of pits crawling with diesel-belching front-end loaders was transformed into not-unattractive grass-covered plains, with the odd pipe sticking out to safely vent methane and dangerous gases.

In the waste-management facility is a small storehouse called "Pick of the Litter", a sort of swap shop where people drop off things they don't want to throw out but feel they have to.

The things that people throw out on Cape Cod are the same things burglars will break into your home to steal in Phuket. There was a wide assortment of electronic appliances that still worked, furniture, luggage and shelves upon shelves of good, hardcover books in like-new con-

dition, all free for the taking. We even found a perfectly good bicycle helmet for our daughter to use while on vacation—something I had planned to go out and buy until

I came across the freebie.

The only thing I really missed about Phuket was spicy food. We discovered that Thai restaurants in the US are abysmal – hopelessly bland, criminally overpriced and with dish after dish that we had never heard of. One restaurant even gave us a fortune cookie after our meal.

Another change in Massachusetts State Law is that they have done away with a statute forbidding weddings between same-sex couples from states where such unions would not be legally recognized, ie, every other state except California.

While Massachusetts is indeed a progressive state, the real reason for the change was so that more gay couples would travel to the state to be wed, thus increasing tourism revenue. Perhaps Massachusetts and Phuket do have one thing in common.

Phuket seen as 'fertile ground' for community mall concept

RAWAI: Phuket is seen as the second largest growth area after Bangkok, say Tesco executives, as two new branches of the retail giant's stores prepare to attract expat and local customers with smaller "community mall"

The new shopping format called @Park is designed to reflect a community market and give shoppers more choice of stores and places to relax in treeshaded areas. The concept follows the Tesco Extra format that has become popular in the UK.

Two @Park malls are set to be fully operational in Phuket next month. One on Chao Fah East Rd in Wichit and one on Wiset Rd, Rawai.

The @Park community mall format is an indoor-market style outlet, which is surrounded by several other independent retail



a variety of stores to shop at rather than a standard warehouse-style supermarket.

The Wichit-based mall was

opened with a soft opening on August 8, allowing Phuket shoppers to get their first taste of the new shopping experience, which has been popular in suburban areas of Bangkok for several years.

The Wichit mall is set on more than six rai, with the main store set at the back of the plot and taking up just 875 square meters of the total shopping area.

In front of the store is a twostory mall with an open-air veranda. The mall section comprises 30 independent shops, including four bank branches, a bookshop and Thai and Western restaurants and cafes on the ground floor, while the upper floor comprises fashion boutiques, a spa, beauty salons and computer and mobile phone shops.

Rawai @Park is currently under construction in Rawai and is set to open its doors to customers some time next month. A definite opening date was yet to be confirmed at the time of going to press.

The Tesco store at Rawai @Park will be called Tesco Lotus Talad (market) and will be the same size as the Wichit store. The total land area covered at this site is just under six rai.

Rawai @Park will also have 22 shop units available for independent retailers to lease from Tesco and is said to be geared toward attracting foreign tourists and expat residents in the Chalong, Kata and Rawai areas with a pizza restaurant, an icecream parlor and a bookshop with an expansive English-language section.

Government Relations Manager for Tesco, Orawan Sirichottirat, told the *Gazette* that Tesco has more socially responsible projects in the pipeline for Phuket following the success of pilot projects in Bangkok but is not authorized to talk about them or make an official statement.

Mall & Media Director for Tesco Veena Arunyakasem was, potential seen in Phuket to continue adding retail outlets.

Vichit @Park on Chao Fa East Rd was given a soft opening on August 8. The new 'community mall' concept has already been a success in the UK and in urban areas of Bangkok. Tesco executives also see the @Park format as being an ideal place for Phuket's local and expat residents to shop.

"We see Phuket as having great potential for expanding the community mall concept. Phuket is a large island with a strong tourist trade with many high-income earners residing here. In terms of sales, our Tesco-Lotus hypermarket in Phuket ranks as one of the top-five stores nationwide. Other big retailers have also opened new stores in Phuket," she said.

"We plan to upgrade our Talad Lotus in Cherng Talay to follow the community mall concept in the near future," Khun Veena added.

"Expanding smaller community malls is easier and requires less investment than creating large malls. The biggest challenge facing operators of community malls is proper research to understand the needs and requirements of consumers living in catchment

Economic woe reaches the far side of the planet

he economic slowdown that is so evident, especially in the US and Western Europe, is making its existence felt worldwide.

Evidence of this is the slowdown in the New Zealand economic slowdown in the New Zealand economic slowdown.

down in the New Zealand economy, resulting in a reduction of 25 basis points (0.25%) in the official lending rate. This is despite the inflationary pressures common to all countries. It is possible that New Zealand is already in recession.


Any hopes that this would not reach across the Tasman Sea to its large neighbor, Australia, seem to have been unduly optimistic. Australia is also showing some signs of cooling. The stock market, as measured by the ASX 200 index and virtually every other relevant index, is down 25% from its highs of less than one year

The currencies of both countries have fallen rapidly against major world currencies, especially the US dollar. This has provoked sell-offs in the famous "yen carry trade" where investors either invest their yen in Australian dollars, New Zealand dollars or both in order to increase their interest-rate return, which is almost non-existent in Japan.

That is one type of yen carry trade. The other is where the investor is not Japanese, but based in a third country. Often this type of investor is a fund or a financial institution that invests by borrowing funds in yen and then converting them to higher-yielding currencies.

This often results in high levels of borrowing (400% to 500%). Because the lender is in a position to recall the loan or ask for immediate additional security, these levels of borrowing are tolerated. This is known as "leverage" or "gearing".

The result of this is that any bad economic news from the targeted country of investment, ie Australia, leads to a rapid downward shift in the value of the Australian dollar. The saving grace of this currency versus the Japanese yen is that the Japanese government reported in August that the economy is deteriorating.



It is widely believed that the world's second largest economy has fallen into recession, which has allowed the yen to weaken.

It was commonly believed in the middle of this year that it was only a matter of time before the Australian dollar (A\$) reached parity with the US dollar. The Aussie dollar rapidly moved from around 97 US cents to 89 US cents as traders and investors abandoned positions.

The central bank of Australia – the Reserve Bank – indicated in early-August that the economic situation allowed for a "less restrictive" economic policy.

James Shugg, a senior economist with Australian banking group Westpac, stated on the television business channel CNBC that they interpreted this to mean that the central bank would cut interest rates as soon as September this year. Previously, they had only expected rate cuts to start in 2009. This is a major factor in the decline in the value of the Australian dellar.

After 15 years of uninterrupted economic growth, falling share prices, combined with falling property prices have left the average Australian feeling as though debt levels are unchanged.

However, it is interesting to see how quickly the world in general reacts to changing commodity prices.

A good example is the oil price. If anyone had suggested at the beginning of 2008 that commentators would be expressing relief that oil would be below US\$120 a barrel by August, their sanity would have been open to question. However, that is exactly what has happened.

It is where we go from here

that matters. According to Deutsche Bank, oil will be around US\$100 a barrel by Q1 2009 and even lower by the end of 2009.

Goldman Sachs, a prominent US banking group, sees the oil price at US\$149 by the end of 2008, a new record; the previous high was US\$147. Goldman Sachs first targeted the oil price at US\$100. It seemed an ambitious price at the time but history shows Goldman Sachs "got it right". It is also one of the few Wall Street banking giants that did not become embroiled, to any marked degree, in the sub-prime fiasco.

There are conflicting signs in the oil markets. There is what economists refer to as "demand destruction" taking place, especially in the US and Europe, as people spend less on oil as the price rises. This can be combined with reports that OPEC members have increased oil production.

The "emerging giants"— China and India – are not actually experiencing the "real" price of oil as their governments subsidize and control retail prices.

This may seem a humane approach and to an extent that is true. But the reality is that it is simply political in nature and sub-market pricing in the longer term encourages higher consumption.

One prominent US economist, Diane Swonk, believes that there is light at the end of the tunnel and the US economy should improve in 2009 and recover thereafter. She did remark, however, that "they" will find another way to "screw up" in the future.

Peek into a hidden world

recent newspaper story reported that a high school in Loei has set up a separate bath room for kathoey students -200 out of an enrollment of 1,200. Two hundred? In Loei?

As in American movies about high school, there are similar factions in Thai schools: the jocks, the brains, the nerds, the cheerleaders. But here you also have the kathoeys.

There have been several academic

studies about kathoeys. But reading them would be like chewing marbles. A few years ago, a readable account called The *Third Sex* was published. The author followed three friends from high school in Chiang Mai through their respective careers: cabaret performer, prostitute and bank clerk.

Ladyboys casts a wider net. Subtitled "The Secret World of Thai-

land's Third Gender" (Maverick House, Bangkok, 2008, 291pp), the book presents intimate profiles of nine kathoeys ranging widely in age and occupation. Authors Susan Aldous (who wrote The Angel of Bang Kwang Prison) and Pornchai Sereemongkonpol spent many hours in in-

terviews with the nine and have written their stories in the first person. Of their impressions about their interview subjects, they write:

"There were certain outstanding qualities that never ceased to amaze and delight us, and they were the willingness, warmth and openness shown to us by all the ladyboys we met. They often seemed way ahead of their Thai non-transgender counterparts in their ability to openly discuss such sensitive and personal issues.


We were truly humbled to have been admitted onto what felt like sacred ground – the naked and vulnerable hearts of our subjects."

The first is Mali, a Patpong go-go dancer and prostitute. She grew up as a buffalo herder in Isarn, but as her sexual life bloomed, she headed for Bangkok and got a job as a waiter and, eventually, a dancer in a bikini and high heels. "Kathoeys are like trees that

grow wild," she concludes. "I don't know what else lies in store for me, but I'm proud of this: I'm my own gardener, watering, pruning and shaping my own tree - my own life. How could I ask for more?"

On the other end of the social scale, Mimi is a fashion columnist. She grew up



in a supportive Sino-Thai family in Bangkok and graduated from a prestigious university. Her first job was as a translator for a women's magazine and she began taking hormones and dressing as a woman full time. "I know physically what I am, but in my mind I am absolutely female and desire a romantic relationship with a straight man."

Pui is a star performer at Bangkok's

Meandering bus services needs straightening up

The announcement by Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) President Paiboon Upatising that the OrBorJor is planning to improve its Green Bus service in and around Phuket City comes as good news for city residents fed up with high fuel costs and the highest taxi fares in Thailand, courtesy of the island's deeply entrenched transport syndicates.

The OrBorJor service, which began amid great fanfare with a free trial period on April 1, 2002, has gone through many changes since that time. It started out using 12 leased Mercedes-Benz buses that proved to be mechanically unreliable and far too large for the narrow city streets that make up much of the service's two route systems. These were replaced in the second year by the fleet of 16 green and yellow minibuses that still run the route today.

Other changes in the service have included a series of different operators contracted to run the buses and the terms under which these contracts were offered. Despite all the changes, however, the fundamental problem that has plagued the system since its inception remains the unacceptably long wait between arrivals typically anywhere from five to 30 minutes, but with reports of waiting up to an hour not uncommon.

The mechanical reliability of the buses continues to be a leading cause for these unacceptably long waits, but another big reason is that both routes plied by the buses meander through the city in ways designed to maximize the system's coverage area all at the expense of getting from point A to point B in anything remotely resembling a straight line.

The route that starts from Big C and eventually reaches Phuket Vocational College, for example, can take more than 30 minutes after passing through Samkong and then making a detour up Mae Luan Rd and then back down Wichit Songkhram Rd.

While these circuitous routes conveniently pass many schools, the initial long wait, coupled with ever-worsening traffic congestion, makes it a poor option for students who need to get to class on time

The idea to monitor the buses for a period using GPS technology and to add songtaews along the same route to cut down on the wait time seems like a good first step in improving the bus service. Hopefully this OrBorJor administration will simplify the confusing route system and take the steps needed to give Phuket City the public transport system it needs and deserves before going on to do the The Editor same in other parts of the island.

The negotiator

My job is to ensure that section 39 of the Consumer Protection Act is adhered to. This part of the act is to help people who have bought something or entered into a purchase agreement and believe they have been treated unfairly or not received the services or goods they were prom-

We help individuals and groups seek justice if they believe they have not received the services or goods they are entitled to or have been promised in advertising.

When consumers have been mistreated and they wish to file a case against a retailer or service provider our officers can help appoint a public prosecutor who will fight their case in court. The service is free and complainants are not asked to pay court fees no matter who wins the

About 90% of the complaints brought to me are issues about property purchase, followed by complaints about products, retailers and services. I also have to deal with issues concerning electronic contracts and advertising.

Property issues can be anything from a developer not informing the public of construction work start and finish dates to volatile land disputes. With those kinds of disputes we primarily focus on negotiation to achieve a compromise or reconciliation between the parties involved, otherwise, they have to wait a very long time for a verdict from the board if a case is filed.

If an issue can't be resolved through negotiations, then the case has to be submitted to the 23 committees that make up the

hen he's not negotiating a peaceful end to warring factions in the cruel commercial world, smooth-talking Passakorn Tanthong, officer of the Phuket provincial branch of the Consumer Protection Board (SorKorBor), is out on billboard patrol and inspections. He said he would rather see both sides go away happy than go through the grief of court cases. Here, he tells the *Gazette* why.



central unit of the Consumer Protection Board (CPB), which is in Bangkok.

As a provincial unit, we don't have the authority to pass judgment on cases brought to us by consumers. Cases are not filed with us. We file cases on behalf of consumers and we have to file them in Bangkok. If a case is filed in Bangkok, all we can do is collect all the evidence here and present it to the committees in Bangkok.

In my first five years here, I only saw one property-dispute case go through this lengthy process. It was not until two-and-ahalf years after the case had been submitted that Bangkok finally responded just to say that they had accepted the case. By this time the complainants had already

passed away.

Imagine what it would be like if every single complaint was sent to Bangkok, where there are only 44 qualified officers on duty and 280 temporary staff.

Part of my job is to get out of the office and inspect places such as construction sites, business premises, car-repair shops and retail outlets, plus we have to check the content of advertising on billboards. We have to plan the inspections with the relevant government organizations, of which there are many, so we are limited in the number of inspections we can carry out at a time.

In 2006 we dealt with 49 consumer complaints. Most of them were about bad service, broken contracts and problems with direct sales. We managed to help

resolve 47 of those cases and two were submitted to the committees in Bangkok. In that year, a total of 2,661,461 baht was returned to consumers who had

filed complaints with us. Since 2007, we have handled 38 consumer complaints and managed to help resolve 26 of those cases. One of those issues is still being worked out between the negotiating parties and two of the cases have been handed over to the appropriate boards to be investigated. Just over 2 million baht has been returned to complainants this quar-

Our provincial office is understaffed. There is only one officer assigned to handle land disputes but there should be at least three officers in that department.

Foreigners sometimes come to us after buying something, such as an Mp3 player, that they thought was genuine only to later discover that it's a replica. In cases like that I talk with the vendor and the customer usually gets his money back. Those kind of negotiations are usually quick but sometimes it can take months for parties to come to an agreement by themselves.

Our work is always appreciated and we're told we are angels when complainants get their way, but when we can't help them, we are called "useless" and asked why we can't do our jobs properly.

All the issues we deal with can be resolved with a bit of give and take on both sides and it's our job to help everybody feel as if they've gained something from negotiations; it's just about knowing what each side wants and what will make them happy.

I don't recommend filing civil cases because they can take

parties lose their power to negotiate. It wastes everybody's time. Finding a compromise is better.

The most difficult issue we have to deal with is when housing estates are planned, sold and built on land that has not been properly registered. New home owners often find they don't get everything they were promised when they first bought their house because the developer has made changes since then.

This happens because many properties are sold off the plan before building permission has been given by the land department for a housing estate to be built there.

Complainants can present misleading advertising as evidence if it shows that what they have ended up with is not what they were promised in the brochures and on the billboards.

Loan agreements for car payments can lead to all sorts of problems. Money-lending companies have the right to reclaim a car if repayments of the loan haven't been made for three months. These days – because of pressure from the Consumer Protection board – the company has to send a warning letter first. They used to be able to take your car without any warning.

In such cases, there's little we can do to help whoever is paying for the car, except recommend a more convenient repayment program.

Issues about mobile phones and the promotions that come with them are a constant source of consumer complaints, which usually occur when people buy phones from unlicensed dealers, who are not able to support the promotions advertised.

We received five mobilephone related complaints last month and we've had four more so far more this month.

If consumers come to me with a complaint and they have a lawyer with them, I will not discuss anything as it would give the lawyer an unfair advantage and he would be able to make more money out of the situation. This would be against our reconciling system of balancing policy.

For certain issues, people should file complaints directly with the offices that deal with them, such as the Provincial Public Health Authority for medicaltreatment issues; the Phuket Provincial Commercial Office for product pricing disputes and the Industrial Office for issues about car repairs.

The Phuket branch of the Consumer Protection Board is in Room 5 on the second floor of Phuket Provincial City Hall.

On the long and winding road to court

n international investor, Mr A, came to Phuket on holiday and saw opportunities to invest in property on the island. He had a Thai friend, Mr B, who also had his own company in the property business. The two investors agreed to form a joint venture to buy some properties that they could develop together.

To do this, they agreed to register a new company so they could ensure that everything was done correctly and legally. Mr B was the active party in the joint venture with 51% of the shares in the new company.

However, before the company registration had been completed, there was a change in the concept of their joint venture. They decided to purchase properties together, but not through the company they both held

shares in. Instead, they bought properties by dividing the cost equally between their two existing companies.

At this point, Mr B decided he did not want to be part of the new joint venture anymore, so he signed his shares and those of the other shareholders – over to Mr A, who then had to look for a new Thai investor to take on Mr B's old shares as Mr A could not hold those shares himself.

Until Mr A could find a new investor to buy Mr B's old shares, those shares remained registered with the Ministry of Commerce as Mr B's shares. Mr A was left **LAYING** DOWN

with little time to find another Thai investor, but eventually found one and went about transferring Mr B's old shares to the new investor and amended the share

By this time, the relationship between Mr A and Mr B had soured and upon learning that his old shares had been transferred to a new investor, Mr B made the claim that he and the other former shareholders had been illegally taken off the share register of he

Mr B filed charges against Mr A with the criminal court, claiming theft of shares by Mr A.

The court made an appointment with Mr A and the other shareholders to decide if there was sufficient evidence for the court to accept the case. After hearing from witnesses, the court decided to dismiss the claim on the basis that because the shares were not physical documents, it was not possible to steal

Mr B then tried a different approach. Using the share transfer documents as evidence, he filed charges against Mr A for misappropriation of shares.

The court again dismissed the case, stating that Mr A had done nothing illegal and had correctly executed share transfer.

The lesson to learn from this is that filing a criminal or civil case is a long, drawn-out process. Even before a case is accepted or dismissed by the court, the court has to hear from all witnesses and look at all the evidence presented before a decision can be made.

Prices are roughly the same on everything I compared, although iPods in Low Yat seem to run 1,000 baht or so less than in Phuket. There's less reason than ever to fly to Kuala Lumpur to buy electronics – unless you want to indulge in the 20-baht-or-so difference in, ahem, pre-recorded CDs and DVDs. KL still has the edge in pirate movies and soft-

The three items on offer in KL that we can't yet get in Thailand, though, are real stunners.

You remember how I've been talking about HSPA and its close cousin, HSDPA? I mentioned the new wireless broadband technology in my columns on May 23 (tinyurl.com/5fecko) and July 25 (tinyurl.com/ 6bwnd5).

While Thailand is floundering in a regulatory vacuum that makes it impossible for any of the telephone companies to build an HSPA or HSPDA network, Malaysia has charged ahead. Right now, for the handsome price of 990 baht a month, anybody in Kuala Lumpur can get a wireless Internet connection rated a 3.6Mbps download speed – and that price includes the hardware modem ("air card"), too.

Both Maxis Broadband and Comcel are competing fiercely for **COMPUTER** customers in KL.

The HSDPA network doesn't yet extend outside the city, but if you happen to be in a location that doesn't have an adequate HSDPA signal, the HSDPA modem automatically falls back to EDGE/GPRS.

At least, that's what the brochures say. I decided to put Comcel to the test. I borrowed a notebook running Vista Home Premium and the standard 990baht monthly Comcel service and pointed the browser at the Speedtest site we've been using here in Phuket for almost a year. (You can test your own system and compare your speeds with other people on the island by going to www.live-access.com/ PhuketInternet.aspx).

The real-world result: Comcel's wireless service in Kuala Lumpur is as good as the fastest wired Internet lines in Phuket six months ago. I saw solid 1.4Mbps download speeds on multiple tests to San Francisco.

That's both good news and bad news. The good news is that Kuala Lumpur's HSDPA runs twice as fast as the fastest wireless service in Phuket (CAT's EV-DO). But at the same time,

Comcel is so over-subscribed at the moment that it runs at onethird of its rated speed.

HSDPA service has only been available for a couple of weeks. Both companies are getting swamped with customers. The same thing will happen here, mark my words.

I was surprised to see how the HSDPA competition in Malaysia reacted. Look at it this way: If you work for a phone company in Kuala Lumpur selling GPRS or EDGE technology – stuff that runs maybe one tenth as fast as HSDPA – what do you do? Why, you market, of course.

The also-rans in KL's online speed competition are pushing reams of glossy brochures, running TV and radio ads, and putting pretty ladies in malls, trying to convince potential customers that their deadend technology cuts the mustard. It doesn't.

The people pushing GPRS and EDGE in Malaysia talk about "4G" technology, which must obviously be better than the "3G" HSDPA. Poppycock. No doubt we'll see the same mindless marketing drivel in Phuket, if the Thai government ever gets its regulatory act together so we can catch up with KL.

I won't hold my breath. There's a lot of money at stake


and plenty of politicians in the middle. By the time we have HSDPA, I bet

Thailand will be playing catch-up with such technological powerhouses as Cambodia and Vietnam both of which already have HSDPA frequencies assigned and maybe even Laos and

The other two surprising discoveries in KL were both ultraportable computers, a horse of an entirely different color.

Many of you know about the ASUS EEE – the very small, very light computer that uses an SD card (like the kind you may have in your camera) in place of a hard drive. EEEs have taken the world by storm, particularly among people who need a lightweight laptop, in all senses of the

word. Even Microsoft is getting in on the act, offering special dispensation for Windows XP to companies selling ultra-por-

Microsoft officially discontinued sales of Windows XP a couple of months ago. While it's true that you can get Windows XP installed on a (very limited) number of new computers - Dell offers several – you actually have to buy two operating system licenses: one for Windows XP and one for Vista.

While you pay for both, Microsoft allows just a handful of companies to sell just a handful of new PCs with Windows XP

Except Microsoft made an exception for ultra-portables. Why? Because these tiny PCs won't run Vista and Microsoft didn't want to voluntarily give up the ultra-portable market to Linux. Thus, most ultra-portable ma-

chines are now being offered with a choice of Linux or (for about 500 baht more) Windows XP Home.

While at Low Yat Plaza, I had an opportunity to actually touch a new ASUS EEE 1000, the latest and greatest - and at 21,000 baht or so, by far the most expensive – addition to the EEE line. The new 10-inch screen and considerably larger keyboard make a big difference. You can't find EEE 1000s many places in the world just yet, but one dealer had them in Kuala Lumpur.

The real eye-opener in Low Yat, for me, was the new MSI Wind Notebook. It's an ultra-portable, too, with a nine-inch screen, but it ships with a real 80GB hard drive. I also like the MSI keyboard better than the 10-inch EEE.


If the name "MSI" sounds familiar, it's because it is best known as a manufacturer of motherboards and other underthe-cover hardware. The Wind Notebook represents MSI's first assault on the main consumer market - and you can't find one in Thailand just yet.

In my opinion, MSI has a winner: I plunked down 17,000 baht and brought one home, complete with SuSE Linux, OpenOffice and 2 GB of main memory. Yes, you read that right; I'm using Linux now, at least while traveling.

When I have more experience with Linux (and Firefox running on Linux) I'll give you a complete rundown. For now, suffice it to say that with the sole exception of Outlook (which I hate, and love to hate), I've found the tiny, nimble MSI Wind to be a tremendous traveling companion.

Chonlatarn on the prowl for title fight

ne Songchai Promotions has been desperately trying to make a world title fight between WBA world champion Chris John of Indonesia (41-0-1, 22 KOs) and their own fighter, Chonlatarn Piryapinyo (26-0, 13 KOs). Unfortunately, events surrounding John's last bout may delay the bout or nix it altogether.

Chonlatarn has been patiently biding his time, slowly moving up in the world rankings. Currently ranked third by the World Boxing Council (WBC), and eighth by the World Boxing Association (WBA), Chonlatarn and his camp feel he is ready to challenge for the title.

Whether or not the challenge comes off depends on whether John remains champion. John had been scheduled to face Jackson Asiku (22-3, 12 KOs), an Australian-based Ugandan who is currently the British Commonwealth champion.

However, the promoter failed to come up with the necessary funds, forcing a last-minute cancellation. This is not the first time this has happened; in fact, on at least two other occasions Indonesian promoters

have failed to meet their payment deadlines.

When the fight failed to come off, a rumor spread that the WBA had stripped John of his title. Exactly why is unclear, but one source claimed it was because John did not make weight. There was no official weigh-in however, so this seems unlikely, but the WBA will meet later this month to determine the fighter's status

he will first face mandatory challenger Hiroyuki Enoki (27-0, 19 KOs) of Japan. The two have a contracted date of October 4, leaving little time for a proposed bout with Chonlatarn on December 5, HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej's birthday. John, who fights an average of three times per year, typically needs six to eight weeks to prepare. The Enoki bout would leave him little time to rest if he were to win and

In the last six years, John has rattled off a string of impressive victories: Ratanachai Sor Vorapin, Oscar Leon, Osamu Sato, Derrick Gainer, Tommy Browne, Jose Rojas (twice) and, of course, Juan Manuel Marquez.

then take on Chonlatarn.

John is Indonesia's champion and superstar, a cultural icon paralleling Manny Pacquiao. The only difference is that boxing fans worldwide recognize

Pacquiao, while John remains practically unknown outside his home country. Those who do know him certainly remember his controversial win over Juan Manuel Marquez.

If Chonlatarn were to defeat the Indonesian, it would be a huge upset and would bring much-needed attention to Thailand's flagging boxing scene.

The Indonesian press is acutely aware of the importance of John. When he fights, TV ratings skyrocket, newspaper and magazine sales increase dramatically and the entire country reorganizes its schedule.

"I've never seen anything like it," said John's manager, Craig Christian. "Indonesians want to know everything about him. They're very proud of him – and he is proud to fight for his country. He does not want to lose the title," he emphasized. "If he ever lost the title, he'd be more upset at disappointing his Indonesian fans than himself."

TV stars, singers, models, politicians and other boxers not only attend his fights, but also turn up at his press conferences. From housewives to factory workers to government officials – 250 million Indonesians know Chris John. What is perhaps even more startling is that in a predominately-Muslim country, a Catholic boxer is the most popular sports figure in the country.

The Gazette first got a hint of John's popularity at the Balikpapan Airport in East Borneo, three days before his March 2006 title defense against Juan Manuel Marquez. While paying for the necessary entrance visa, the Immigration officer asked the purpose of the visit.

"To cover the Chris John fight."

"Oh," he said with a smile.
"Chris John – the boxer. Are you a journalist?

"Yes."

"Please sir, come with me," he said, grinning. Seconds later, we bypassed the lengthy queue and cleared Immigration.

In 2002, John took a major step in his development when he faced 53-fight Ratanachai Sor Vorapin of Thailand. Wary of the Thai's reputation and power, John fought tentatively. He eked out a decision win, but the victory was less than satisfying.

"I admit I was nervous before the bout," said John. "It was an important fight and he was very experienced. I didn't perform my best because my conditioning was less than optimal, but fortunately I won the bout."

When the WBA bumped Juan Manuel Marquez from regular champion to super champion, John was automatically elevated from interim champion to regular champion. The Indonesian press was unforgiving, however, referring to him as a paper champion. John responded with typical humility, saying, "It's all right they're calling me a paper champion. I must work harder."

More than two years after defeating Juan Manuel Marquez, the debate among fans over who actually won the bout continues. Some say it was close and could have gone either way, some say Marquez was robbed and others think John outboxed the Mexican.

John, however, doesn't mince words. "The Marquez fight was definitely my toughest fight, but I think the decision was fair. He can say what he wants, but I beat him."

Chris John could have easily followed the same path as the majority of Indonesian boxers, fighting for next to nothing in relative obscurity, but he has capitalized on his opportunities and never looked back.

Chonlatarn Piriyapinyo can only wait and hope he gets his shot at the world title. That's only the first step. He'll need to wrest the title from the champion if is to make a name for himself world-wide

World title challenger Terdsak Jandaeng (30-3-1, 20 KOs) of Thailand just can't get a break and has become the epitome of the phrase "close but no cigar". He has challenged unsuccessfully for world titles on three occasions and his never-say-die ring attitude nearly prevailed in two of those fights.

When he traveled to Zamboanga City in the Philippines on July 27 to face undefeated Filipino prospect Eric Canoy (7-0-1, 5 KOs) in a bid for Canoy's lightly regarded WBO Oriental featherweight title, he went into the bout as the favorite.

However, once again, denial slapped Terdsak hard across the face. After a close opening three rounds, a headbutt between the two fighters caused a nasty gash to the eye of Canoy, prompting referee Bruce McTavish to stop the fight.

Under WBO rules, a bout stopped before the completion of round four can only result in a technical draw. Canoy retained his title and Terdsak came home to Thailand empty handed.

Also on the card, Samransak Singmanassak won a six-round decision over Felix Tanamor and Narindech Kokietgym dropped an eight-round decision to Federico Catubay.





New police headquarters on verge of completion

PHUKET CITY: The new Phuket Provincial Police Office building currently under construction on Yaowarat Rd opposite the old police office building, is now about 90% complete and should be ready in time for a grand opening ceremony on October 13 – National Police Day.

Due to expansion of the police force, the new three-story office building will replace the 40-year-old building currently in use.

Pol Maj Chaturong Laddayam, inspector of general staff of Phuket Provincial Police Office, told the *Gazette* that construction of the new office is being carried out by Anda Phuket Construction Co Ltd at a cost of 21.4 million

"Work should be all wrapped up by September 6, as was agreed in the original contract," he added.

The new building sits on a three-rai plot near the Forensic Science building and has been funded by the Royal Thai Police. The building measures 41 by 15 meters, making for about 1,800 square meters of total floor space.

On the first floor there will be offices of administration, accountancy and general staff. The Phuket Provincial Police Commander and Deputy Commander's offices will be on the second floor along with the Policy and Plan division and a meeting room large enough to accommodate 60 people.



The new Phuket Provincial Police Office building should be ready in time for a grand opening on October 13, but staff may have to wait a little longer before they can begin work in the new structure.

The third floor will be the new home of the investigation section, operation center, the IT section and a smaller meeting room with capacity for 30 seats.

The building will be in the shape of an upside-down T, with extended areas on the first two stories.


Although the building work is almost finished, a schedule for transferring staff from the old

office to the new one has yet to

"The budget will only cover the building structure and 10 airconditioning units, so we will need additional funding for the interior decoration and office materials. We are unable to transfer our materials from the old building to the new one," he said.

"We have to raise the money from local administrations and the private sector. We have already found one company that has donated a fence. We will move all sections into the new building when we are ready, but this could be some time after the construction work is actually finished," he added.

The current police building is set to be used as an additional office for the crime suppression and investigation teams.





f you're the kind of person who likes to inspire a reaction from visitors to your home, why not try having a life-size sailfish head bursting through your living room wall?

No matter whether your friends think it's totally tacky or wonderfully wild to have fiberglass marine creatures suspended from your ceiling, poking through walls and floating over bookshelves, a brightly colored tuna suspended in an action pose is definitely going to be a talking point

From a distance, these replica marine animals look like the real thing; only on closer inspection do you realize that they have been crafted from fiberglass and expertly painted to look as if they just jumped out of the sea and onto your living-room furniture.

The collection of crafted sea creatures in the Chalong workshop and museum of Marine Life Phuket includes manta rays, leopard sharks, blue marlin, barracudas and groupers.

The replicas are either hung from the ceiling, mounted on the walls, set in shields like trophies or they simply stand alone, ready to be placed on a counter top or shelf.

The idea of creating these replicas came about when an Australian sportfishing enthusiast – the late Ian Pike, who is a bit of a sportfishing legend Down Under – began encouraging other sportfishing enthusiasts to embrace a more eco-friendly way of displaying their trophy fish.

The usual practice among sportfishing enthusiasts who have caught a whopper and wanted permanent proof of their catch is to have the fish stuffed and mounted.

Ian Pike is credited with convincing hardcore sportfishing traditionalists to release their prize catches instead of killing them so they could be mounted.

There's something fishy going on...

The reason for Ian's success in converting the traditionalists was his ability to make life-like models of any fish, allowing replicas to replace the real ones and bask in a fighting pose of eternal glory or about five years' worth if you keep them out in the sun.

Marine Life Phuket does a steady trade year-round but a lot more sanding and painting goes on at the workshop in November when Phuket hosts a number of fishing tournaments. Many of the competitors order replicas of the fish that they catch, which they have to release anyway.

The shop uses measurements taken of prize fish caught before they are returned to the water. Craftsmen then spend the next few days creating a mold based on those measurements.

Ian Pike founded Marine Life, but died recently. Mr Pike was mentor and close friend of Bancha Koypokaisawan, who now runs the workshop. Khun Bancha received his initial training in fish fabrication from Mr Pike in Australia 17 years ago.

Khun Bancha loves sportfishing, but spends his spare time studying books of different kinds of fish in order to recreate them. It takes Khun Bancha's team of craftsmen about three days to complete an order.

The most popular order is for sailfish, but the largest sea creature he has created is a life-size whale shark now on display at Phuket Aquarium. Many of the other fiber fish at the aquarium have been made by Team Bancha.

The shop has many small models. Being so life-like, they are excellent props for teaching children about the basics of marine ecology. These range in price from 120 to 800 baht each, depending on their size and complexity.

"These three-dimensional

As bewildering as a bignonia

nglish is mad. Seriously. We must have one of the most ridiculous languages in the world – it's totally screwed up. No wonder people have problems learning to read or write in this ridiculous form of code - just look at the spelling. I mean, how is any word containing the letters "ough" actually supposed to be pronounced? Who decides?

"Off" (cough), "uff" (rough), "oh" (dough), "oo" (through), "aw" (fought) or, even for us Brits, "ow" as in 'plough'. How about the even more nonsensical "hiccough" or "thorough"? None of this makes any sense whatsoever – it's almost as if the original inventors of this language were having a bit of a laugh and making it up as they went along in a way that was guaranteed to cause maximum consternation among its future users. They definitely succeeded.

What chance do we stand with words like byte, bite and bight; sense, cents and scents;

their, there and they're or wheel, weal and we'll? What possible justification is there for the spelling of gnat, psychiatrist, pneumonia, isle (or aisle if you prefer), wrinkle, debt or listen? Just how do you pronounce wind, read or defect?

The daft thing is that spelling really doesn't matter, according to recent research done by people who seem to know what they're talking about. Read this:

Accdrnig to rscheearch at an Elingsh uinervtisy, it deosn't mttaer in waht oredr the ltteers in a wrod are; the olny iprmoetnt tihng is taht the frist and lsat ltteer is at the rghit pclae. The rset can be a toatl mses and you can sitll raed it wouthit too mcuh of a porbelm. Tihs is bcuseae we do not raed ervey lteter by istlef but the wrod as a wlohe.

Even elementary speakers and readers of the Thai language understand that Thai people don't usually "spell" words as such they just say them a bit more slowly to the person listening.



Why? There are very few ways it can actually be spelled.

We may get a bit confused over the letters that seem to be based on variations of Us and Os, but as far as Thai people are concerned there are very few different ways that most words in their language can be spelled. Remarkably sensible. What a shame that the high and mighty English language hasn't cottoned on to such an eminently logical idea.

The world of plants can often be as perplexing as the English language when it comes to spelling. The first time I heard the word "bignonia", I was convinced that the person providing the information was either dyslexic or a complete buffoon. Bignonia doesn't even sound like a proper

But it is. It has absolutely nothing to do with a drunken begonia, or even "nonias" that are above average in size, although it probably should. Unfortunately the people involved in naming plants are usually worryingly sober; something I have tried to address on occasion. Some of my best plant names have been beerinduced.

The unlikely sounding bignonia is actually named after a French royal librarian by the name of Jean-Paul Bignon who I understand was around in the 17th century. He was some kind of royal librarian, apparently, and responsible for one of the silliest and most unlikely plant names ever. After all, he was French. Probably something to do with all that garlic.

Bignonia is the common name for a medium-sized family of mostly tropical woody climbers, the most common of which in this part of the world is probably the purple bignonia. Sorry, but it really is one of those plant names that you can't quite manage to say and keep a straight face. In Thai this daft-sounding plant sounds much more sensible - they know it as the baan-buriimuang or the muang-mani-rat.

The showy flowers we see on the purple bignonias are, not surprisingly, remarkably purple. Some varieties have creamywhite throats (the tubular part in the middle) while others are a bright yellow further down. It's one of those plants you probably walk past every day, as its spectacular colors just blend into the backdrop of plantlife in Phuket.

Here's where things get a bit technical. The corolla (a rather impressive word for group of petals) is fused together with five lobes and is funnel-shaped in the middle with two or four stamens attached to the inside surface. The vividly colored flowers have

adapted to pollination by a variety of flying animals, including insects, birds, and bats. Hummingbirds love these things.

Originally from Columbia, bignonias are mostly found in tropical areas; ideally suited to Phuket life. The greatest concentration of species is in South America, where they form dense climbing vines in the forests. Some of the tropical bignonia family members are exploited for timber.

It's unlikely that you'll find the bignonia sitting there growing on its own; by nature it's a bit of an idle beast. Although it grows vigorously and incredibly quickly, it does enjoy a bit of help. Being a climber, it much prefers to have something that it can clamber up for more than a little moral support. Its school report would have said "Tries hard, but needs to work a little more independently."

These things are perfect for covering trellises, fences and archways, and will even bound relentlessly up walls if you dingle a few lengths of wire between some of those masonry nails knocked in among the bricks. It gets a bit woody after a while and bush is the inevitable result.


It's happiest in full sun, and doesn't need a huge amount of water to stay content. Don't get too worried if the flowers drop off on a regular basis - it produces so many of the things daily that a mass of purple splodges on the ground will be a bigger problem than a naked purple bignonia.

Well, I think I've done rather well today. I've had a go at anyone who speaks English, along with the buffoons who invented the rules that come with it, as well as the inevitable go at the French. Time for some plantnaming inspiration, I feel. By the way, exactly how big Jean-Paul's non was has never been confirmed.
