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### Airport closure cost B250m a day

PHUKET AIRPORT: Losses of an estimated 250 million baht per day have been reported to an adhoc committee set up to monitor and control safety at Phuket International Airport following the Peoples Alliance for Democracy (PAD) anti-government protests.

Phuket International Airport was closed at 4:50 pm on Friday, August 29 and did not reopen until 11 am, Sunday, August 31. Marking the return to normal services was the first departing flight, THAI Airways flight TG213 at 2:10 pm, and the first inbound flight arriving at 3:30 pm.

Following the closure, an **Emergency Operations Com**mand (EOC) was set up at the airport's VIP lounge on the Saturday with about 90 uniformed officers on duty, comprising military and volunteer personnel.

Phuket Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima, who was acting-Governor while Niran Kalayanamit was in Bangkok, is currently president of the EOC, which will be stationed at the airport until it is deemed no longer necessary.

The EOC committee also includes the deputy commander of Region 8 police, the commander of Phuket provincial police, the mayor of Thalang, the Phuket Chamber of Commerce, the Phuket Tourist Association, the Thai Hotels Association, the Department of Transport, airlines that were affected by the protest and the Phuket International Airport director.

The committee met at 9 am on the Sunday and decided that it was safe to re-open the airport at 11 am.

A Ministry of Interior offi-

cial who asked to remain anonymous said that the PAD had been infiltrated by a third party that was trying to discredit them.

In doing so, according to the committee, they caused loss of revenue amounting to 250 million baht per day.

The committee reported that the airport closure had forced the cancellation of 88 outbound flights and 93 incoming ones (126 domestic flights and 55 interna-

Consequently, about 13,000 passengers missed their outbound flights while some 17,000 missed incoming flights, the EOC reported.

Some 137 tonnes of air cargo was also delayed.

A total of 11 airlines had to cancel flights. These were: Thai International, Dragon Air, Silk Air, Air Asia, Bangkok Air, Malaysia Air, Jet Star, Sky Star, China Air, Tiger Air and Nok Air.

On Septmeber 3, The Nation quoted Tourism Council of Thailand (TCT) chairman Kongkrit Hiranyakit as saying the worsening political unrest was prompting tourists and businessmen to cancel their trips to the

"Initially, we expected this would cause damage of between 50 billion and 60 billion, or up to 10% of targeted revenue of 700 billion baht," he said.

The state of emergency was declared at a bad time, with September being the usual booking period for the high season. About 40% of the industry's revenue was usually generated in October and November, he said.

The TCT plans to ask the Tourism and Sports Ministry to launch emergency measures to restore tourist confidence and approve use of the 400-millionbaht Tourist Fund to assist stranded tourists, he said.

#### Japanese tourists cancel trips to Phuket

PHUKET: More than half of the Japanese tourists who planned to visit Phuket during the week after the closure of Phuket International Airport (PIA) on August 29 canceled their bookings due to concerns over political unrest in Thailand.

Phuket Tourist Association (PTA) President Somboon Chirayus on September 1 told the Gazette that despite the re-opening of PIA on August 31, there had been many cancellations among foreign tour groups.

Cancellation rates among Japanese visitors were the highest, at about 50%, he said.

Khun Somboon, of Merlin Phuket Hotels and Resorts, said the direct flight from Narita to Phuket was operating at halfcapacity. These flights had been nearly full every day before the recent increase in tensions in the capital and closure of Phuket Airport by protesters over the weekend, he said.

"We need time to make tourists understand that the situation is back to normal," he said.

It is still too early to judge the effect of the airport closure on Phuket tourism, but the distress and inconvenience suffered by passengers who were unable to catch their return flights is bound to leave a bad impression, he said.

Embassies around the world are closely watching the situation here and travel advisories warning against travel to Thailand would have a negative impact, he added.









#### Bus crash causes injury, commuter misery

THALANG: Four people were injured when a bus with bald tires overturned on Thepkrasattri Rd on August 27, leaving commuters stuck in a traffic tailback stretching well over five kilome-

Seksan Konsakorn of Thalang District Police told the Gazette the six-wheel bus skidded out of control in wet conditions on a curve near Tha Reua Shine, where it crashed into a roadside power pole and came to rest on its side, blocking all northbound

Police and rescue workers were on the scene soon after the accident, which occurred at about

Seriously injured were bus driver Sommana Nilmanee, whose liver was ruptured by the impact with the power pole, and a female passenger with serious head injuries requiring a brain scan. Her name was not disclosed.

At last report both were being treated at Vachira Phuket Hospital's Intensive Care Unit.

All three passengers in the bus were employees of the Trisara Phuket at Nai Thon, Maj Seksan

The driver would be questioned after he is sufficiently healed. He will likely face charges of reckless driving resulting in the injury of others, he said.

The bus, operated by the Phuket ARS Tour company, had several tires that were almost completely bald.

A crane finally removed the wreckage from the road at about 9 am, much to the relief of scores of stranded motorists.

#### Spaniard's death being treated as suicide

PATONG: Police are treating the death of Spanish national Josemaria Garcia Gonzalez, 38, who fell from the balcony of his room on the seventh floor of the Club Andaman Beach Resort on August 29 as a likely suicide.

He fell from the same floor where a female US marine fell to her death in June.

Patak Khwunna of Kathu Police said that he was informed of the death by a staff member at the resort at about 7 am.

There was no evidence that Mr Gonzalez had been involved in a violent struggle, Capt Patak said.

Room 708, where Mr Gonzalez was staying, had no signs of foul play, but there were a large number of empty whiskey and beer bottles. His shoes were on the balcony and the room's door to the corridor was locked from the inside, he added.

A hotel chambermaid who said she saw Mr Gonzalez jump told police there was noone else on the balcony at the time.

Mr Gonzalez's body was sent to Patong Hospital for examination by doctors and police forensics experts.

### Pian keeps digging for Patong tunnel

PATONG: Pian Keesin, the recently re-elected Mayor of Patong, on September 1 announced he will continue with his plan to build a tunnel under the hills separating the popular beach resort town from Phuket City.

"We plan to set up a budget to study and research the impact of building a tunnel, in the hope that – if there are no objections – we can finish the research and design stages within a year and a half," he said.


Mayor Pian admitted that the project was still a long way from becoming a reality.

"Whether this project will go ahead depends on environmental factors, tourism and how local businesses, organizations and people will benefit from it.

"We are still talking with investors and considering how much budget should be set aside for research before we decide on a big project like this," he said.

Mayor Pian's announcement followed the first meeting of the new Patong Municipality 18-seat council on August 29.

The meeting, chaired by



Mayor Pian has yet to announce who will be his "Deputy Mayors" and consultants, which are non-elected positions.

It is expected that Chairat Sukkabal, who was one of K. Pian's Deputy Mayors throughout his first term, will be reinstated

So far, only three Phuket businesses will join the event. Phuket FantaSea will send 10 staffers, including management and performance actors, to man two booths at the expo.

The Phuket Export and Manufacturing Association (PEMA) will occupy five booths, presenting local produce, including fresh and dried seafood, cashew nut products, abalone products and fish balls.

DEP Deputy Director-General Niramol Charoenphao still hopes that Phuket will be better represented, especially in the "City of Charm" zone, where Phuket spas, hotels, travel agents and hospitality businesses can pitch their sales to mainland Chinese.

'Unfortunately, we are still missing Phuket's most prominent point, which is tourism," Khun Niramol said.

"We expected spas, travel agents and hospitals to join, but as the economy has slowed down, businesspeople are being more wary about the potential returns," she added.

#### **Highways Office chief** ordered to speed up **Chalong Circle removal**

PHUKET CITY: Phuket Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima has told Saroj Suwinchai, the chief of the Phuket Provincial Highways Office, and Paiboon Upatising, president of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*), to expedite removal of Chalong Circle.

At the monthly Governor Meets Press meeting at Provincial Hall on September 1, V/Gov Worapoj said, "Ît's too old and not attractive for people who pass by and see it. I need to make it better.

"Also, there are serious traffic jams there in the morning and evening. So it should be done quickly." V/Gov Worapoj said.

Khun Saroj explained that he had to first apply to the OrBorJor for permission to remove the roundabout, including the large fountain that is the centerpiece of the circle, as the *OrBorJor* had paid for it, and thus it was *OrBorJor* property.

"The OrBorJor has now given us permission to remove it. But when I went to inspect the roundabout, I saw that the fountain is about three meters wide and made of concrete and steel. So now we are looking for a way to remove it," he said.

However, V/Gov Worapoi said, "I have asked K. Paiboon and he has agreed to remove it, but I still need you both [Saroj and Paiboon] to co-ordinate the budget required and get it done."

K. Worapoj told the press that the OrBorJor were coordinating with Srisoonthorn Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor) to expand the road around the Heroines' Monument by six meters.

"It will be good for traffic because every car must pass at that monument to come to Phuket City. The OrBorJor has given about 10 million baht to Srisoonthorn OrBorTor for the project.

"However, they have encountered a problem and are now in negotiations with a private landowner there," V/G Worapoj

He added that Srisoonthorn OrBorTor will soon receive 27 million baht to install roadside drainage ditches along Thepkrasattri Rd from the Heroines' Monument to Koh Kaew.

"We need to fix the frequent flooding problems that follow heavy rains. The budget has been approved by the provincial committee and it will be given soon so the project can be started," he

#### Phuket PAD protests continue; government utilities threatened

PHUKET CITY: About 1,000 protesters marched on Provincial Hall on September 2 in support of the People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) demonstrations in Bangkok. The PAD wants Prime Minister Samak Sundaravej to resign.

The large crowd was bolstered by many people who had turned out to rally against the violence in Bangkok the day before that left one PAD member dead and several others injured, resulting in PM Samak declaring a state of emergency in the capital on September 2.

Natjarong Ekpermsup, President of Phuket Watch, told the Gazette, "We are here to show our support for the Bangkok PAD, who are trying to oust Samak. We do not want the airport blocked as we need it ourselves so that we can send reinforcements up to Bangkok.

"I can't say how long the protest will continue because it really depends on the government. I have contacted the Krabi PAD and told them to protest at their Provincial Hall rather than at their airport."

Clarifying why protesters were still at Phuket International Airport, he said, "Now, at the airport there are about 200 people who refuse to follow PAD instructions. They are not PAD

members, they are just bystanders. We have asked them to join us here at Provincial Hall.'

However, Khun Natjarong forewarned that the PAD may yet step up its campaign.

"On September 3, electricity and water supplies to government offices will be cut off.

"I think the government is cornered now so they have to hire agitators to try to disrupt peaceful protests.

"In my opinion, Samak's government announced the state of emergency in Bangkok to divert attention from the main issue, which is the need for him to resign as Prime Minister.

"We will meet the governor and ask him to forward our request to the government to stop using violence against the people.

"There should be no double standards. They should not block the PAD and then allow the United Front for Democracy to do as they please."

Phuket PAD protesters on September 2 boarded five buses bound for Bangkok. "Protesters from Haad Yai, Surat Thani and Phang Nga will also head to Bangkok to join the PAD rally there," K. Natjarong said.

#### 'Bang Hem' voted Pa Khlok OrBorTor president

PA KHLOK: In unofficial results of balloting held August 31, Athipong Khongnam defeated incumbent Panya Samphaorat by 261 votes to win the presidency of the Pa Khlok Tambon Administration Organization, or OrBorTor.

Turnout saw 6,307 of the sub-district's 8,131 eligible voters (77.6%) making it to the six polling stations, which were open from 8 am to 3 pm.

Voters also cast ballots for representatives in nine individual constituency seats.

Some 1,000 people turned up at the counting station at the Phuket Panyanukul School. At about 10:30 pm it was announced that Athiphong "Bang Hem" Khongnam had garnered 3,024 votes to win by a narrow margin over Panya Samphaorat, who tallied 2,763 votes.

There were 348 spoiled bal-

lots and 172 voters ticked the "no vote" option on their ballots.

The results have yet to be confirmed by the Election Commission in Bangkok, and thus remain official.

Although small in terms of registered population, Pa Khlok is one of the island's fastestgrowing tambons, with many new residential housing projects mushrooming throughout the area.

#### huket International Airport (PIA) Director Wicha Nernlop told the Gazette that all airlines operating out of the airport resumed their normal flight schedules starting at 11:30 am on Sunday, August 31.

The airport and the carriers that service it did their best to help passengers left stranded during the closure, with THAI Airways, Bangkok Airways, Thai AirAsia and Korea-based Asiana Airlines all adding extra flights, he said.

THAI Airways led the effort, adding three flights with a capacity of about 500 passengers back to the capital on the Sunday afternoon and evening, he said.

"So far we haven't been informed of any decrease in the number of passengers taking flights to Phuket," he said the day after flight services had resumed.

"The passengers who wanted to come to Phuket and were stuck in Bangkok are happy; they still want to come to Phuket, as they understand Thailand's political situation. However, they still don't understand why Thai people are destroying their own country this way," said Wng Cdr Wicha.

As for the damage to glass doors in the lobby, he said Airports of Thailand (AoT) is still considering taking legal action against the person responsible.

### The long road to

ith political events in the Bangkok still unfolding by the minute as this edition goes to print, there is little doubt that the two-day closure of Phuket International Airport will have a deep impact on the island's all-important tourism industry.

Gazette staff interviewed several tourism and aviation industry experts to get their initial reactions on what those effects might be.

"The person responsible has expressed guilt and knows he shouldn't have done that," he said.

Although K. Wicha hadn't seen much of a short-term effect when interviewed by the *Gazette*, he thought that travel agents and airlines will have their work cut out for them in keeping the number of high-season arrivals at target figures.

Phuket's high season for tourism officially starts November 1 with the three-day Phuket Carnival in Patong and generally hits its peak from Christmas through till the end of February or mid-March.

Heady predictions for a 20% increase in the number of tourists arriving in Phuket in 2008 would probably have to be reevaluated in the light of the airport closure and the ongoing struggle in the capital, he said.

Methee Tanmanatragul, President of Thai Hotels Association Southern Chapter, estimated that the total revenue to Phuket as a result of the local protest amounted to 250 million baht per day; with the price tag for the entire southern region at about 400 million baht per day.

K. Methee, whose business

interests include the Rising Sun Residence in Chalong and the still-under-construction Regent Phuket on Cape Panwa, said the impact on tourism depends in large part on the ability of both the central government and the anti-government protesters to refrain from holding Thailand's considerable tourism assets hostage in their power struggle.

If Thailand's international reputation as a safe tourist destination is compromised, it will inevitably have a large negative effect, he said.

"Both the government and the protesters need to realize this. They can close down offices anywhere else, but not the airport. Nobody gains from closing the airport. Such an action negatively affects the livelihood of everyone – not just people living in Phuket, but also those in Phang Nga and Krabi," he said.

"Our association and the TAT [Tourism Authority of Thailand] are now finding a way to get tourism back to normal. Everyone has a part to play in ensuring that tourists know there will be no similar incidents like this in the future.

"I think the tourists who were affected by this incident are going to spread the word about their bad experience to others, so we have to make every effort possible to get our positive image back," he said.

Overall, however, K. Methee remained guardedly optimistic.

"I think if there aren't any more incidents like this, then it shouldn't affect our prospects for the upcoming high season too much," he said.

In the hours that followed the declaration of a state of emergency in Bangkok, South Korea and Singapore, both important sources of foreign tourists to Phuket, issued advisories urging its nationals to avoid "non-essential" travel to Thailand.

Many other countries, including the US, Australia and Taiwan, sent out warnings to its citizens already in Thailand to be particularly vigilant.

Wolfgang Meusberger, General Manager of the Holiday Inn in Patong, agreed with PTA President Somboon that events in Bangkok would largely determine what the impact on Phuket tourism would be.

He said his staff always spoke positively and reassured guests of their safety while on holiday in Phuket.

He said, however, that anticipated occupancy rates at the resort were about 20% lower than the expected figure of about 80% for this time of year.

Taxi and limousine drivers were first to feel the pinch of the airport closure. Phuket Limousine and Business Services Cooperative (PBC) President Saravoot Sisakukam, put the loss in income to his 120 members at about 200,000 baht per day from the

Mr Saravoot, who is also the President of the Mai Khao Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor), said the takeover should never have been allowed to happen because the fortunes of everyone in Phuket are tied up with tourism in one way or another.

"We received many complaints from our customers and our staff lost a lot of income."

Sombat Atisate, President of the Kata-Karon Hotels Association, estimated the total loss in revenue over the closure period at about 10 million baht for his association's 36 member hotels, which have a total of about 5,000 rooms. Cancellations were at about 20%, he said.

Most of the tourists he talked to seemed to understand the situation, he said.

"I don't think this will affect the upcoming high season as I think the situation will improve before then," he said.

The "wellness" industry is yet another segment of the tourism industry that has not been doing so well as a result of the closure. Sasithorn "Aom" Pinthing, Marketing Manager of Sukko Spa said, "We have been affected greatly by the PAD rally at Phuket Airport last Friday. Normally we have about 100 customers per day, including both walkins and those on package tours. Now we have just 20 to 30 customers a day," she told the Gazette three days after the airport had reopened.

"Worse is that we have been receiving emails from tour agents saying they want to cancel tours they had booked in September," she said.



### Police gear up for Veggiefest 2008

PHUKET CITY: With the start of the annual Phuket Vegetarian Festival just a month away, Phuket City Police met representatives of all participating Chinese shrines to ask for their co-operation in keeping this year's event as safe and orderly as possible.

A key issue is traffic control, especially during the many street processions that are the highlight of the festival.

Phuket City Traffic Inspector Teerawat Leamsuwan said most – but not all – of the shrines had adhered well to the predesignated routes during last year's processions. He asked the shrines to provide good guidance to the many mah song (spirit mediums or, literally, "entranced horses").

"I am afraid accidents could happen if the *mah song* wander off while their bodies are possessed, so it is very important for their handlers to keep them on the correct route," he said.

weapons such as swords and bayonets commonly used by the mah song be kept to reasonable lengths.

As for roadside stalls selling vegetarian fare, he said canopies could extend a maximum of 1.5 meters from the curbside to allow traffic to pass.

All vendors must display a certificate issued by a participating shrine to prove they have paid the necessary commissions. All violators, including those who set up stalls outside the designated zones, face serious fines,

#### Hapless 'cop' lucks out of love

According to the girl's neighbors, her pursuer, calling himself Pol Maj Krittanan Rattaradee. moved in near her house in Sanpatong district and enjoyed parading around in his uniform telling people that he was there on top-secret business.

The neighbors, sensing that the behavior of the new resident was inappropriate for an officer on a secret mission, became suspicious that Maj Krittanan was not all he was claiming to be.

The trickery finally came to light when, somewhat foolishly, the lovestruck major began showing off his fake ID card, which showed him to be a police major based in Nakhon Ratchasima. One of the neighbors managed to get hold of the card and make a photocopy before returning it.

On the morning of August 11, a group of villagers headed to Sanpatong Police Station with the copy of Maj Krittanan's ID card to check if he was really an officer of the law. On running the name through police databases, police found that there was no Maj Krittanan on record and the police department that the card stated Maj Krittanan

Crime Suppression Inspector Maj Suthep Jilo then accompanied the villagers to find Maj Krittanan. This proved easy and the group soon came across their quarry wandering down the Sanpatong-Mae Wang road dressed in full uniform.

On searching Maj Krittanan, police found not only the fake ID card and a plastic toy pistol he kept in his holster, but also a copy of the official stamp of the Governor of Nakhon Ratchasima.

After being hauled into the police station, Krittanan finally admitted that he was just a 36year-old regular citizen from Pathum Thani, though Krittanan Rattaradee was indeed his real name.

He told police he had met a girl from Sanpatong when she had been living in Bangkok and he had instantly fallen for her. When she moved back to her home town, he followed her.

Every morning he would dress up in full uniform and walk past her house telling her he was off to work on secret business; every evening he would repeat the charade on his way home.

The only purpose he used the uniform and false ID for were to show off to the girl, Krittanan said. He did not explain why exactly he thought the major's uniform would increase his chances with his sweetheart.

Regardless, police charged him with im-

#### 17 arrested in gambling sweep

PHUKET: In the latest bid to crackdown on illegal gambling on the island, 17 people were arrested in two weekend raids led by Phuket Provincial Police Commander Apirak Hongthong.


On August 23, eight were arrested in a suspected "high-low" gambling den in Tung Tong.

On the premises, police found 250 baht and papers believed to be high-low score cards. Seven of those arrested were held on 5,000-baht bail, while bail for Tassanee Klaharn, 37, believed to be hosting the activity, was set at 10,000 baht.

All have confessed to the charges, police said.

On August 24, Phuket City Police nabbed nine suspected gamblers and recovered 5,340 baht in cash and a deck of cards in a guest room at the Kathina Hotel on Sakdidet Rd in Phuket City.

Room number 1202 proved to be not so lucky for the seven women and two men police found inside and arrested.



#### Buffalo ladyboys' carjack capers

CHIANG MAI: If you happened to have been out drinking in Chiang Mai over the last few months and, after a few too many beers, decided to do the responsible thing and pull over in your car for a rest to sober up before weaving on home, then you may have come across the Buffalo Ladyboy Gang.

The gang has not only robbed more than 40 drunks, but also performed oral sex on their slumbering victims to boot.

Police at Muang Chiang Mai Police Station have this year been receiving a slew of reports of robberies from sheepish men who claim that while they were sleeping in their cars, a group of four rather camp crooks have broken in and made off with their possessions.

As all the attacks happened very late at night and the victims were often three sheets to the wind, police had been unable to bring enough evidence to apprehend the gang – despite having a good idea of who they were.

On August 20, however,

this all changed when Sirichai Wutinansurasing, 34, walked into the station with a familiar tale of woe.

K. Sirichai told police that the night before he had been out on the town in Chiang Mai. Setting off home, he realised that he was in no condition to drive. Sensibly, he parked his car on the side of the Chinag Mai-Lampang road to sleep off the effects of all the alcohol he had consumed. Not so sensibly, he forgot to lock the car door.

The next thing he knew there were people in his car hunting for his valuables. Perhaps more worrying was the fact that one of the intruders was fumbling with his belt. Instantly sobering up, K. Sirichai fought off the intruders, who ran away while shrieking girlishly.

K. Sirichai noticed one of the four attackers was also morbidly obese, and thus had difficulty keeping up with his friends. K. Sirichai also got a good look at the man who tried to molest him.

On hearing these graphic descriptions, police instantly realised that this fitted all the hallmarks of an attack by the infamous Gang Kratoy Khwai, or the "Buffalo Ladyboy Gang", so named because of their portly

Shown the police black book of known criminal offenders who happened to be of the "third gender", K. Sirichai was soon able to pinpoint the perpetrators.

Chiang Mai Muang District Police Deputy Superintendent Bunyawat Kertklam then led a team of officers to the gang's known hideout – a dormitory in Saraphee District.

There police arrested Thanaphat "June" Thepawan, 38; Kritsada "Oh" Wichai, 25; Monchai "Mew" Lamnuan, 24, and Kritichai "Nong Nam Daeng" Kanthaya, 22, the Kratoy Khwai from whom the gang got its name. Police also seized 15 mobile phones, two laptop computers, a gold chain and a number of pawn shop tickets for mobile phones and jewelry.

Confronted with the evidence, the suspects admitted everything. They said that they had robbed at least 40 victims. Their modus operandi was to search for drunks sleeping in their cars who had forgotten to lock the doors. Finding one, they would post one man as a lookout while another took his valuables and third restrained him. Mew told police he performed oral sex on the hapless drunk as a token way of compensating for the stolen loot.

All four were charged with robbery, but it was not reported whether there were any charges of sexual assault.



### Are you copyright? Or copywrong?

he United States Trade Representative (USTR) elevated Thailand to the Priority Watch List (PWL) in its annual Special 301 Report, issued under the US Trade Act, on the grounds that there had been an increase in intellectual property (IP) violations in Thailand.

Considering that the above claim has direct bearing on the country's standing within the international community, the Thai government has developed a clear policy to tackle all violations associated with IP rights.

Presently, there is a nationwide crackdown, which has caused much commotion on the island – especially in entertainment venues raided for copyright violation during the past few weeks.

The Department of Intellectual Property (DIP) is the principle agency in the development of IP systems in Thailand and aims to develop sustainable IP protection by working closely with other relevant government agencies.

DIP Director Gen Puangrat Asavapisit said, "IP awareness events were held on December 5, 2007, so that the Thai public can follow in the footsteps of His Majesty the King, who is revered as the Father of Thai Innovations and who is aware of the importance of the creation, protection, and utilization of intellectual property in a systematic and comprehensive manner.

"Accordingly, a contest was held under the theme of sufficiency economy," he said.

Often joining local IP raids is the National Cultural Commission's Phuket office, which is located in Phuket City's Poonpol district, famed for its karaoke bars and massage parlors.

Although the NCC is not directly responsible for IP rights protection, it is responsible for issuing licenses to karaokes. The type of license issued depends on

whether or not the establishment provides girls to sit and drink with customers. This office is also responsible for issuing licenses for Internet cafes and vendors of CDs, VCDs and DVDs.

In addition, in order to ensure effective prosecution of IP violation cases, the government is co-ordinating closely with all relevant law-enforcement agencies, including the Office of Attorney General and the Central Intellectual Property and International Trade Court, to facilitate legal proceedings, such as the issuance of search warrants and appropriate sentences and penalties.

Pim Choowong, an IP representative for RS Promotions, informed the *Gazette* that he had come up against "dark influences" when trying to clamp down on some bars in Rawai and that some local police officers were providing protection.

In order to deal with resistance to conforming with license requirements, Khun Pim is now co-ordinating with senior officials in several departments. He expects to return to Phuket very soon with a large team to ensure that IP is being respected.

In addition to Phuket Provincial Police, Public Health and Revenue Department inspectors might also join the teams raiding entertainment venues in the "service" industry.

Sutthisak Prasatkrarukarn, Director of Laws and Suppression Department for Thai Copyright Collection Co Ltd (TCC), met Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit on May 19 this year to explain to owners of entertainment establishments about licensing requirements so that they would have fair warning before the crackdown.

"I would rather establishment owners obtained licenses than to file charges against them for IP violations." K. Sutthisak told the *Gazette*.

Readers should note that although the suppression of music-related IP offenses has been

in the spotlight recently, the DIP is clamping down on all IP violations, ranging from cable TV piracy to counterfeit pharmaceuticals, software and books.

Music protection includes the lyrics, tune and all sounds made during recordings. Sound recordings means any music with or without lyrics from any source, be it from a recording, movie or concert and refers to all methods of storage including CD, VCD, Minidisk, DVD as well as computer files such as MP3 or MIDI files.

Responsibility for licenses lies with owners and management of venues and organizers of events, when there are several parties involved then all of them are jointly liable.

One bar owner in Rawai complained to the *Gazette*, "If it's my CD bought legally, then why can't I play it wherever and whenever I want?"

A license is needed whenever music is played publicly. However, if the event is for charity, then it is wise to indicate so on the license application form – the license might be issued free.

Publicly means anywhere public and includes places such as bowling alleys, cinemas, supermarkets, spas, hotels and hospitals. Any private company that throws a party needs a little license for the event. If call holding music is used for the telephone system, then a license may also be required.

Acquiring a license can be done through a non-profit joint venture formed by Music Copyright Thailand Limited (MCT) and Phonorights.

MCT is a musical work's copyright owner organization established in 1994 that represents international and Thai musical composers and authors for copyrighted musical work of its members and the members of some 30 affiliated foreign societies. MCT is also a member of CISAC (The International Confederation of Societies of Authors and Composers).

Phonorights (Thailand) Limited is a sound recording right owner organization established in 1997 that represents the sound recording work's copyright owners, covering more than 10,000 labels – or 90% of all copyright owners of sound recordings worldwide.

Phonorights also works closely with The International Federation of Phonographic Industry (IFPI).

Pathamabhan Pawai, Business Affairs director for Sony, said that Sony – like other big labels – have signed powers of attorney for multiple agents such as MCT to act on their behalf in Phuket.

She explained that private owners of CDs are allowed to make one copy of the CD onto a personal computer or Ipod for personal listening, the files must not be shared with others.

Technologies now exist that enable them to catch people who are transmitting sound files to others, for example, by using Bluetooth.

Some bar-owners told the *Gazette* that they were being threatened with fines higher than the maximum 200,000 baht quoted in last week's *Gazette*, K. Pim explained, "If they have multiple violations found on their hard disk then they will receive multiple fines. We can multiply the fine by the number of violations.

"In the arrest witnessed by the *Gazette*, we singled out four songs that we heard playing. We recorded evidence and seized the machines for inspection and found further evidence. We imposed fines only on the songs that we heard playing publicly and four times 200,000 is 800,000 baht.

"If we listened for longer, then the fines could have been even higher," K. Pim said.

The bottom line is that if you play sound recordings in public without a license, a court order can be issued to stop you playing sound recordings altogether – as well as making you pay damages and costs.

Note that the DIP does not issue licenses. Those wanting to obtain licenses can find out what type of license is needed, how much it will cost and how to file an application by calling MCT-Phonorights (JV) at 02-6415211-3 or the TCC at 02-9388000.

Fertilizing violence. A member of Krabi Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) was shot dead in his fertilizer shop August 28. Police believe the victim's support for a kamnan (tambon chief) in an upcoming election provided the motive for the killing.

Prawut Phikunsonthava.42. was shot twice in the face and once in the collarbone with a 9mm pistol in the fertilizer shop he owned in Ao Luek District.

The victim's wife Acharee Phikunsonthava said that around midday, two men pulled up outside the shop on a motorcycle. One of the men then walked into the shop and asked K. Prawut if he had any fertilizer for palms. As K. Prawut was answering, the man drew a pistol and shot him three times before running back to the waiting motorcycle.

Sonthaya Aolueknoi, a member of Krabi OrBorJor who knew the victim, said that K. Prawut was a good man and an able politician who was well liked by his constituents. He had no disputes with anyone, K. Sonthaya added. K. Acharee also said that her husband had no business disputes that could have provided a motive for his killing.

Police said that K. Prawut had recently declared his support for a kamnan in the area who is standing for re-election, and this could have been the reason for his shooting.

K. Prawut was member of Krabi *OrBorJor* for Area 1 Ao Luek District and was serving his second term at the time of his death.

ATM case continues. Haad Yai police have arrested a village chief on suspicion of murdering three witnesses to the theft of an ATM machine who were shot dead in June.

On August 25 at Haad Yai Police Station, Maj Gen Wirun Iamphaijit, Commander of Songkhla Provincial Police, told reporters that police had arrested Chaiyut Binae, 42, Chief of Village 7 Tambon Thung Wang,

Muang District Songkhla, on suspicion of premeditated murder.

Gen Wirun said the charges related to the killing of Thaweep Chainu, Sukhiu Chainu and Suphit Phuttharat, who were all shot dead as they were driving through Tambon Koh Taow in Muang District Songkhla June 17.

Thaweep had confessed to being involved in the theft of an ATM machine from outside Haad Yai Social Security Office on January 24, 2007, and was the primary witness in the case against his co-accused: Chaiyut, Prayat Phengsuwan, Loh Kasemsuriya and Phakdee Chaplee. Thaweep's brother Sukhiu was also acting as a witness for the prosecution.

Police found fingerprints of Chaiyut, Prayat and a third man, Praphan Inthadong, in the pickup used in the shooting, which the gunmen abandoned after losing control and crashing while making their escape, Gen Wirun said.

Police said that Prayat, the alleged gang leader, was already in custody in Krabi while co-accused Praphan was still on the run.

Goldshop carnage. A policeman and two robbers were killed in a gunfight during an attempted robbery of a gold shop in Krabi on August 29. A third robber was later shot dead by police.

At 11:30 am, a team of officers led by Krabi Provincial Governor Siva Sirisaowalak and Maj Gen Phison Noksakul, Commander of Krabi Provincial Police, went to the crime scene at Sin Huat Heng 1 gold shop in Maharaj Rd.

Lying in the shop doorway they found the body of Sen Sgt Maj Bunsong Ratanatraimas, a Crime Suppression Squad Leader at Muang Krabi Police Station. He had been shot in the face with a shotgun.

Inside the shop police found the body of a masked man who they have yet to identify. A shotgun was lying next to the body. A second robber, identified as Nong Khai native Jakrakrit Khamphila, 22, had already been taken by police to Krabi Hospital suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. He later died from his injuries.

Shop staff told police that two men had come into the shop while a third waited outside on a motorcycle. When they entered the shop, Sen Sgt Maj Bunsong, who was stationed to protect the shop, challenged the men and a gunfight ensued leading to the deaths of all three men inside. The man waiting outside escaped on his motorcycle.

Around 12:30 pm, police received a report that a man fitting the description of the third robber had been seen riding past Krabi Technical College. Officers riding in a Krabi Phithak Pracha Foundation rescue truck rushed to the scene and found the man on Tha Reua Rd.

The rescue truck driver rammed the suspect, who fell to the road and then fired at police with a shotgun, police said. Police returned fire, killing the man, who was identified as Sathit Sithithaweekul, 27, from Krabi.

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#### 45-year-old-man who suffered a head injury in a motorcycle accident died after he was turned away by 17 National Health Security Office (NHSO) state and private hospitals, the

victim's sister has alleged. Hua Hin resident Namphueng Sotthinpintha, 36, said that last year her elder brother Mongkon was admitted to a local government hospital after he suffered acute brain edema.

Mongkon needed emergency surgery to treat the brain injury, but the hospital's only brain surgeon left to fulfill his monkhood duties and Mongkon had to be transferred to another hospital, Khun Namphueng said.

Hospital staff approached 17 other hospitals in the region without success, she said.

A nurse advised Namphueng to have her brother admitted in a private hospital nearby, but it charged 100,000 baht for the surgery, which she could not afford.

Her brother died seven hours later.

After her brother died, she filed a complaint with the NHSO, which is responsible for healthcare service to patients registered under the universal healthcare scheme. Five months later, the NHSO paid her 200,000 baht in compensation.

The NHSO receives more than 1,000 complaints a year about referrals. Some hospitals decline to admit emergency cases because they do not have enough beds or specialists, Deputy Secretary-General Dr Peerapol Suthiwiseth said.

The number of complaints would increase due to insufficient healthcare infrastructure, he added.

In a bid to solve the problem, the NHSO has set up a hotline at Tel: 1330 to better manage referrals.

Meanwhile, the Public Health Ministry is planning to set up 12 referral centers to collect data about numbers of beds, doctors and specialists and to provide this information to hospitals that propose to transfer patients.

proached local film studios to collect the master reels, which it can no longer store in its vaults.

Chalida Uabumrungjit of the Film Foundation said some were in bad condition, scratched and melted. If they can be kept at 4°C and 30% humidity they can be preserved for another 150 years, she said.

The existing archive, which now comprises more than 1,000 masters, has space for just 20

The foundation is planning to raise 10 million baht to build a new vault to house 1,000 more masters, she said.

K. Chalida insisted that keeping the masters is important, even if they were recorded onto DVDs. "It's not true that disc quality is better than a master copy. Keeping the original gives incomparable detail on screen, she said.

"10,000 baht can save one film for 150 years. It is not expensive at all," she said.

Isarn horror smash. A pickup truck crashed into a trailer truck was reported.

The accident happened in Phanom Phra district at 8 am, when a pickup speeding to transport voters to a tambon administrative organization election swerved out of control after one of its tires burst. The pickup crashed into the truck parked on the roadside.

Fourteen people died at the scene and two others were injured. All were riding the pickup.

Frightening E-fags. Using electronic cigarettes to quit smoking is hazardous to your health and nervous system, as they cram too much nicotine into your blood, a study has revealed.

Mahidol University dental school researcher Dr Varanant Buejeap said electronic cigarettes contain nicotine and 28 carcinogenic substances, such as "alkaloid-a", which releases substances that have amphetaminelike effects.

These stimulants increases blood pressure and lipids in blood vessels, making the heart work harder. This can lead to heart failsaid.

Nicotine released by the electronic cigarette is absorbed into blood vessels faster than regular cigarettes and will stay in

chewing gum, she added. The electronic cigarette is not recommended as a tool to quit smoking, she said.

the body longer than nicotine

"It is better to just stop smoking. Avoid smoking an electronic cigarette if you are using nicotine gum, as it will not help much. Instead, it will cause lung, liver and mouth cancers," she added.

Corny cache. Police on August 24 announced the biggest haul of ya bah (methamphetamines) in recent years after some 1.7 million pills were found under corn in a lorry in Chiang Rai's Mae Sai district. Deputy national police commissioner Preawphan Damapong said he expects a major drug trafficker to be arrested as a result of the seizure.

However, there were no reports of such an arrest in the mainstream media by the end of the month.

Storm in a teacup. The Thai Meteorological Department (MET) said there is only a "very small" chance a true "storm" would hit Bangkok, although the southern provinces of Prachuap Khiri Khan, Chumphon and Surat Thani faced possible flooding from October to December.

MET Weather Forecast Bureau chief Somchai Baimoung told a recent water management meeting a storm surge could only happen if there was a tropical cyclone with gusts of more 118 kilometers per hour.

Using a model at the meeting, K. Somchai showed that storm surges do not affect vast

If a storm did hit Bangkok, it would be concentrated in the narrow Samut Prakan Bay, he

There is only a 1% chance a storm surge would directly hit Bangkok and people should not worry because storm warnings would be released five days in advance, he said.

Rainfall was higher this year in the North, Northeast, South and the Central regions compared with last year, he added.

### Animal clinic destroyed by arson

fire believed to be caused by a home-made bomb has destroyed an animal welfare facility on the island of Koh Pha-ngan.

The building, occupied by non-profit organization Phangan Animal Care (PAC), was destroyed when arsonists carried out the attack on August 1 at around 10 pm.

Witnesses told police that motorbikes were heard in the area before the fire broke out. It is believed a brick was used to break a window in the building and then a homemade bomb similar to that of a Molotov cocktail was then thrown into the structure causing an explosion and igniting the blaze.

Two cats were the only casualties from the resulting fire. One died from its injuries while the other was rescued. No other injuries were reported.

The clinic has been operating on Koh Pha-ngan since 2001 and is supported entirely by donations and volunteers.

Police and residents are baffled by the attack and are carrying out investigations as to who may be responsible and what their motive for the attack may have been.

"We are all shocked and saddened by this development. For over seven years we have given every ounce of ourselves to help the animals of Koh Phangan and the island as a whole.

"Our work is funded by donations alone. All earnings are reinvested into improving the lives of the island's animals," said a volunteer at the clinic.

"All of our work has been called to an immediate halt and the staff removed from the premises until the problem has been identified," added the volunteer.

#### Man found at sea after mutiny.

A man spent three days floating in the sea before being rescued after the boat he had been working on was taken over by its Burmese crew members.

Saknarong Sangchoo, 32, of Patthalung province, was one of several crew members working on the fishing boat *Sila Kaew 3* when its Burmese crew of 11 staged a mutiny after allegedly being maltreated by the Thai fisherman on board.

Mr Saknarong hid in a freezer on the boat during the attack, which took place when the boat was between Koh Samui and Koh Pha-ngan.

He told police that he lost consciousness while in the freezer and awoke when the boat began to sink and the freezer quickly filled with water.

His escape from the sinking vessel left him drifting at sea for three days without food or water before a passing fishing boat rescued him.

Three Thai men are believed to have been killed when the mutiny broke out.

Police believe a body that recently washed ashore in Ban Thongnian in Khanom is one of those men.

Four of the 11 Burmese were rescued by passing boats after it sank. The men told police that they staged the mutiny only after enduring severe physical abuse from the Thai crew.

Police said that the rescued men were intending to take their catch ashore to sell, but later ran out of petrol and were caught in rough seas, causing the boat to sink. It is unknown what happened to the remaining crew members. **Second global mala announced.** After a very successful first year, organizers of the Global Mala Samui have announced plans for another event this year.

Global Mala Samui 2008 will again be held at Tamarind Springs in Lamai on September 21 with a theme of sustainable living.

The event will feature practical demonstrations, workshops for adults and children, eco-products, healthy food and live music to promote mindfulness to help heal the ailing natural environment.

There will also be particular emphasis on the problem of water and how to use less, recycle more and keep our oceans blue.

The organizers promise a day of fun and action. The day will begin with an opening cer-

emony to start the "green clock" on Samui.

There will be booths for organizations involved in environment preservation to showcase their work and display ecofriendly products.

A tree-planting ceremony will be held and guests will be able to buy trees to take home and plant.

In addition, a children's seminar will be held on the day before the main event with teambuilding exercises for a core group of young environmental activists. They will then lead other children in activities on the day of the Mala.

The keynote speaker at the event is Dr Tom Goreau, President of the Global Coral Reef Alliance

He was Senior Scientific Affairs Officer at the United Nations Centre for Science and Technology Development and his major focus now is on coral reef and fisheries restoration through community-based coastal zone management in developing countries, especially island nations.

The event is held on the United Nations Day of Peace and funds will be raised at the event via donations, entrance fees and a raffle, as well as from sales of food and drink.

Funds raised during last year's event supported pilot projects to teach young minds about the environment through an initiative called The Seedlings Club.

Forest walks, snorkelling trips, radio shows and performances also received funding from that event and plans to continue those programs are already in place, according to the organizers.

ai Yang Beach on a Sunday afternoon is a regular hive of activity. Even though the tide is right out today, kitesurfers hone their skills in the brisk August breezes. Mr Kobi's Bar ("Broken English Spoken Here Perfectly") is closed, but there is another beach bar featuring overpriced beer in which to catch up with my nephew Ollie, and Sue – his glowing bride.

They're here on their honeymoon. Sue is from County Cork in Ireland and Ollie is from the capital of Ireland – Liverpool – so what better milieu to catch up with each other than the neighboring Rivet Grill in Indigo Pearl Resort?

We arrive on the stroke of seven o'clock to enter a restaurant cloaked in a lighting setup

normally associated with French cathedrals at dusk and pea-soup fogs in Hitchcock movies.

Feeling our way to the table, we're soon ensconced in a seating arrangement

that resembles two hotel foyer telephone booths pushed together. The cutlery and highly polished glasses glint in the penumbra and when the wine and aperitif list arrive I instinctively run my hand over the print to check if it is written in Braille. It's not.

Frankly, I can't read or indeed feel a word so we do the sensible thing and get another candle for the table: a whole lot safer than torching napkins to read by

Anyone who has read Emile Zola's 19<sup>th</sup> century naturalist novel about mining in the north of France, *Germinal*, would feel right at home here as the entire resort is themed on Phuket's tinmining past of 150 years ago.

There are rivets on the floor, rivets on the walls and in the loos; even some cutlery has spanner endings but there's really no immediate need for this appendage



as the wine, an Australian Shiraz Cabernet (1,890 baht), comes with a bottle screw top.

And the menu, too, is a right riveting read. For starters we choose steamed crab meat, seared scallops and grilled foie

gras – all wonderfully executed. Main courses? Sue goes for Oz milk-fed veal medallions (990 baht) while Ollie – a big lad – opts for a 250g American Black Angus (1,950 baht) and

me, after a couple of glasses of the excellent Shiraz, I let myself be persuaded to try the uniqueto-Phuket Oz Wagya 200g sirloin (definitely expensive).

Regular readers of this column will by now be looking out for just when and where I put the reviewer's boot in. But seriously folks; the main courses at Rivet Grill lend no such excuse for typically Liverpudlian behavior. Never mind the lugubrious lighting; the execution and presentation of each drink and dish at Rivet grill as sensations go, is... well, sensational.

As for me, if I eat enough carrots, I shall eventually see well enough to distinguish the wine list at Rivet Grill from the *International Herald Tribune* but the food – along with the service – is of international standard; make no mistake about it.

Sue "bolts" for the Ladies

by maneuvering her-and-Ollie's ambulant "phone booth" backwards and in so doing almost runs over a passing waitress. After excellent chocolate pudding and tiramisu, we lads relax over Irish coffees in a decidedly smokefree environment while Sue – the only Irish person present – enjoys a green tea crème brulée in the process. Life's little ironies, eh? Dark corners, a simple stark setting and cutlery with spanner endings together make the Rivet Grill a unique place to dine.

In summary, what can I say? I'll leave it to the lovely Sue: "I love the amount of thought that has gone into this place. All these nuts and bolts."

Special mention should be made of Indigo Pearl's Sunday brunches. Check out the offers at www.indigopearl.com and tune into the weekly events. Definitely a place to enjoy fine dining with great service in the north of the island.

# The gathering of thousands of anti-government protestors outside Phuket Airport on Friday, August 29 was a crowd filled with a mixture of emotions which spilled over to the tourists attempting to enter or leave the airport during the protests. Some cried whilst others laughed. Phuket PAD Protests What the people say

#### A tourist interviewed by PGTV:

"I know what's happening, it's a revolution, a coup d'etat regarding the King and Queen and the different governments. I think there must be a democratic solution — I don't like the inconvenience."

### Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit speaking from the airport as the facility was being closed down:

"This is people power, if we try to stop them, they will become more violent, so we need to negotiate with them.

"They have already stormed the airport and created damage. We have spoken with PAD representatives, but they are unable to control the protesters. There are many groups: students and local villagers have also come here.

"We have to temporarily close the airport otherwise the protesters will not leave the building. This is a political stunt. PAD members are continually in contact with the PAD in Bangkok."

#### Tuesday, September 2. PAD supporters rallying at Provincial Hall:

"Five hundred of us arrived



in front of Phuket Provincial Hall at 8 am. Most of us are members of Phuket PAD and Phuket Watch, but there are people from other groups who

have come to support our cause.

"Samak should not have declared a state of emergency. One of our protesters was killed in Bangkok last night."

#### Phuket Vice-Governor Tri Augkaradacha:

"We have permitted the mob to use our electricity and provided a toilet bus for them, so there is no need for them to come in the building at all.

"The PAD need electricity to set up many speakers and a big screen to show the live ASTV broadcast from Bangkok so they can closely follow the situation."

#### Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Col Paween Pongsirin:

"I have been ordered to come here to monitor the situation. I hope they do not stay here

too long, but at least being here is better than being at the airport. I heard rumors that some protesters would like to rally at the airport again."

#### Muang District Chief Wisit Kurattanavate:

"Vice-Governor Tri has asked me to be here to observe and help control the mob so that there is

no violence. Their protest seems to be peaceful so far, though. We have assisted them by providing them with electricity and mobile toilets that are parked just outside."

#### Natjarong Ekpermsup, President of Phuket Watch and Phuket PAD leader:

"The mob is here to show our support for the Bangkok PAD, who are trying to oust Samak. We do not want the airport blocked as we need it ourselves so that we can send reinforcements up to Bangkok.

"I can't say how long the mob will stay here because it really depends on the government. I have contacted the Krabi PAD and told them to protest at their Provincial Hall rather than at their airport.

"In my opinion, Samak's government announced the state of emergency in Bangkok to divert attention from the main issue, which is him resigning.

"On September 3, electricity and water supplies to government offices will be cut off. I think the government is cornered

now so they have to hire *NorPorKor* ["mob agitators"] to try to disrupt peaceful protests.


"We will meet the governor and ask him to forward our request to the government to stop to using violence against the people. There should be no double standards. They should not block the PAD and

then allow the United Front for Democracy to do as they please.

Natjarong Ekpermsup

"We plan to go to Bangkok this afternoon in five buses. Protesters from Haad Yai, Surat Thani and Phang Nga will also head to Bangkok to join the PAD rally there.

"Now at Phuket International Airport there are about 200 people who refuse to follow PAD instructions. They are not PAD members, they are just bystanders protesting and we have asked

them to join us here at Provincial Hall."

#### Winai Chid-Chiew, Kamnan (Tambon chief) of Kata:

"I think this way of people expressing their opinions is good. It shows that Thailand is moving towards the next step of democracy. This shows that society is changing. This is the result of about 40 of the constitutional laws.

"We should let both sides

share their opinions so that everything is fair. We must select the correct path and follow the decision of the public. However, we must not have violent incidents like those in Bangkok last night."

#### Leader of Rajabhat University's student union, Anantapong Kunjan:

"After our student union committee heard the news that one PAD member died last night,

we were not happy. We had a meeting this morning to ask students at the university to do something to show the government.

"We came to Provincial Hall at noon to join the Phuket people who are against the violence that happened last night. We came here to use our right to protest in order to cheer up the PAD supporters in Bangkok," he added.

"We need the prime minister to think about what most benefits our nation before he decides

how to deal with people."

#### Phuket Senator Phummisak Hongsyok:

"I am worried about the situation in the country nation now, especially since the airport was blocked by the PAD on August 29-31.

"Phuket's image is seriously tarnished because Phuket airport is an international airport.

"I am consulting with the Tourist Association, Southern

Hotels Association, Phuket Chamber of Commerce and Phuket Industry Association about methods to alleviate the situation.

"We will have a press conference with the media at 4 pm. We all need to stop the mobs as soon as possible.

"We need all sides to use the peaceful ways to talk together. The people do have power, but they need to think about the nation's long-term image. I need this to stop quickly and for us all to return to normality."

#### A German Tourist:

"If these people do not have a natural disaster then they create a man-made one of their own.

"Regarding the declaration of a state of emergency announcement in Bangkok, I do not agree with this decision. I think it will create more conflict rather than ease the situation.

"If the government cannot resolve outstanding issues, then they will need to consider very carefully all that they have done. There are almost 1,000 people here now and I think a lot more will come tonight."

#### British tourist Dominic Whitehead:

"The protest is really pathetic; quite small. I guess the Phuket people are quite lazy. Support is going down after all the mess created and locals are shocked by the violence they see on TV."

#### A French tourist:

"Ah, for me it is no problem but imagine if you come with your family and children – it would be a nightmare."

#### Tah Chat Chai policeman:

"We cannot do anything. The police created a problem in Bangkok by attacking protesters. Closing the airport is illegal, if we try to stop them, though, things could get nasty and the government would blame us. My station has 90 men, the island has 1,200 policemen, we are simply outnumbered."

Where did it come from this "Brunch"? What on earth does it mean?





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
### Happy Birthday Harry














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#### he latest addition to the impressive Mercedes-Benz line-up is its fantastic two-seater sports coupe-cabriolet, the 5.5-liter V8 SL500. Not suitable for everyone, but an amazing sports model that continues the prestigious line for Mercedes-Benz.

The most recent model in the extensive Mercedes-Benz line-up is the new SL500, equipped with a silky V8 engine, which in turn is mated to the Mercedes award-winning sevenspeed automatic transmission. Optional – read "cheaper" – are a six-speed manual gearbox or a five-speed automatic.

Power output from the big V8 is a healthy 388 bhp, or 285 kW, while peak torque is achieved between 2,800 and 4,800 rpm, reaching 530 Nm. The result of all this gives the SL500 a sprint time from a standstill to 100 kmh of just 5.4 seconds, while maximum speed is electronically limited to 250 kmh.

The latest SL-Class has had a significant face-lift and features new lamps, a more prominent radiator grille and "gill-like" trim panels on the front wings.

The folding metal roof of the SL can disappear at the press of a button and takes just 16 seconds to lower into its own compartment. The Mercedes-Benz engineers in Germany have gone to a great deal of trouble to ensure that with the roof folded, there is still room for luggage. The roof mechanism is extremely clever and allows even golf bags to be carried in the trunk while the roof is down; roof up, the trunk is cavernous.

A novel – very useful – feature is a "hill-hold" device that enables the driver, by pressing once hard on the brake, to activate a full brake-on system until

the merest touch on the accelerator releases it; perfect for traffic conditions, particularly on in-

Inside the car, the instrument cluster shroud features improved shading, while there is a 3D instrument cluster with hanging needles and a sporty multifunction steering wheel in a threespoke design with a matte chrome decorative insert.

Although the SL500 is only a two-seater, there is a great deal of luggage space behind the seats, including lockable storage boxes. There are several other storage compartments dotted around the interior, including one under the passenger seat.

The interior is, as you would expect, extremely well finished and includes cruise control, automatic climate control, a premium sound system of 510 Watts with no fewer than 10 speakers. Electrically controlled seats that can "remember" two preset configurations are standard, while for colder climes the seats have heat-

The handling is almost perfect due to the light weight of the SL – the hood, front wings, doors and trunk lid are all aluminum while there is little "roll" in the corners.

The suspension is firm and there is some tire thump over uneven surfaces, but

this is a sports car after all and the noise is not particularly intrusive. Indeed, the ride is very comfortable in all driving situations.

The C63 that featured in these pages recently (Gazette, that are quite narrow for Euro-

pean backsides, but comfort in the SL-Class is exemplary. No complaints whatsoever about the accommodation.

In addition, the seat belts are integral with the seats precluding any contorted attempts to reach a remote belt.

Access to the rear is achieved by an electric switch on top of the backrest, which slides

the seat forward, although in reality there is little usable space behind the front seats.

The SL500 is not for everyone, and is certainly not cheap. The Mercedes-Benz official website lists only

the SL350, which is priced at 11.79 million baht; the SL500 would have to be specially ordered. For more information visit www. mercedes-benz.co.th

### Market action pointing to US rate rise

he US dollar, in recent years, has steadily fallen against virtually all major currencies. This has been propelled by a huge trade deficit, the major component in the even larger current account defi-

This, naturally, should be self correcting. The US dollar falls in value progressively, making imports more expensive and exports Federal Reserve must be up-

cheaper, that is, more competitive. This is now happening; it does not follow a perfect pattern because the "real" world constantly interrupts the textbook economic world.

Perhaps a good example is the increased price of imported fuel that swells the overall import bill as around 50% of

US oil needs are sourced from abroad. It certainly has encouraged US companies to engage in exports, in some cases for the first time in a company's history.

The revival in the fortunes

Federal Reserve (the "Fed"), has in the past year reduced its base lending rate – the "Fed Funds Rate" - from 5.25% to 2%. When interest rates are low, there is less incentive to hold a particular currency.

However, the market obviously believes that interest rates in the US have reached a bottom and the next move by the US

wards.

Naturally, the Fed has its critics. One more prominent critic is Willem Buiter, a former Bank of England policy maker and now professor of European political economy at the London School of Economics and Political Science.

He was invited to address the Fed's recent an-

nual gathering at Jackson Hole, Wyoming. He was strident in his criticism of the Fed, stating that, "they cut the official policy rate too fast and too far and risked its reputation for being serious about

Bank, however, was supportive of the Fed's policy, stating that Europe has not yet been hit with "the volume of shocks" to its economy that the US has suffered. He also stated that had he been in Fed Chairman Ben Bernanke's shoes, he would have made the same policy decisions. Trichet stated "I do not agree that the Fed is too accommodative."

The Fed has looked a harsh reality in the face and has been determined to cushion the situation as much as was reasonably possible. There is still a lot of pain to be felt in the US economy, but perhaps within the next year the economy will reach a bottom from which to start a recovery.

Investors should be very aware that the effects of reduced interest rates are already benefiting the economy but the credit crisis is keeping interest rates at inflamed levels.

Those who call on the Fed to raise interest rates at this stage are doing America no favors. There is little evidence of secondround inflation; unemployment is still rising and this helps to keep a cap on incomes. The credit crunch is alive and well and this reach bottom, however, stock markets have usually already discounted this in the price and have moved ahead.

The stock market, in previous situations, is usually around six months ahead of the real economy. Therefore, it is often just when everything looks at its worst that stock markets move ahead and it is also true that the initial rise is often the greatest in the whole future economic cycle.

Most investors will, naturally, miss the first rise as they follow the herd. It is not easy being a contrarian investor but in the longer term it is the only way to make maximum profits.

The other route is simply "drip feed" or use Dollar Cost Averaging whereby funds are added to the market on a regular basis. This takes care of the problem of market timing by simply averaging in entry levels.

The problems many investors face are procrastination and greed. The stock market is not a place to try and make a quick buck. The response to the old adage: "What is the definition of a medium-term investment?" is "A short-term speculation that went wrong."

It takes time to make money. I recently came across a case where an investor lost a sixfigure sum in US dollars trying to play financial games with the private banking division of a large international bank.

The investor was lured into

something called "dual deposits", basically a "play" on US dollars and Australian dollars. Investors must be aware that when they demand higher returns from big banks, these banks are waiting for them. It is simply the same mindset (creative thinking) that created Structured Investment Vehicles (SIVs) and the like.

The bottom line is simple: the bank is seldom taking a risk. It leaves that to the client. However, it is going to make a profit and the client must pay.

The more difficult and demanding a client is, the more opaque the financial products the bank will offer. Bankers realize that most people's egos will not allow them to admit that they do not understand what is being proposed.

However, it has been my experience that most of those who have been "caught" by the private banking divisions of major banks have usually had much more greed than sense.

To be fair to the banks, it is usually only when a client has refused all other alternatives that the banks start playing "shell games" – caveat emptor.

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### Top hotels lend a helping paw

five-star resorts located in Rawai, Khao Lak and Koh Yao Noi have in common? At first glance you'd be forgiven for thinking, "Not a lot".

However, drive up to the Soi Dog Foundation (SDF) shelter in Mai Khao, look around and the answer becomes clear. The two main accommodation blocks at the shelter are made up of eight large runs, each named after the sponsor that paid for its construction.

The first run is named The Six Senses Phuket shelter. Its cost was funded by a

private donation from Eva Malmstrom and Sonu Shivdasani of the Evason Phuket & Six Senses Spa, but the connection does not end there.

Soi Dog Foundation is a long-time favorite

charity of Eva and Sonu (an SDF dona- awards for its environmental programs, tion box sits in their head office in Bangkok). As a result, Area General Manager Henry Gray and his wife, Char, visited the shelter to see what all the fuss was about. After their visit they were determined to do more. With the blessing of Sonu and Eva, funds were raised at a recent group conference held at the Evason Phuket resort.

This resulted in a new play area where volunteers who visit the shelter can take their dogs and let them run free while being protected from the elements. In addition, with finance from their community

The Six Senses Destination Spa on Koh Naka Yai has already committed to improving one of the other runs and Char is now looking for other hotels in the area to do likewise.

"The subject of stray dogs is a problem in Phuket. Soi Dog Foundation is a prime example of an NGO contributing invaluable volunteer work towards such a challenge that helps alleviate their suffering. They represent a very good example

of a local organization, which is co-ordinated, driven and successful at what it achieves," Henry said.

Each hotel in the group has its own full-time environmental manager. In a world where there is ever more concern about the environment with eco-based holidays on the rise, such an approach is good for the environment – and it makes sound economic sense.

The Sarojin hotel in Khao Lak is also a strong supporter of SDF. Joint-owner Andrew Kemp, concerned about the growing number of stray dogs, is financtime veterinarian through the hotel's community fund.

The fund, which supports community-based projects, has had a big impact. As Khao Lak continues its rapid growth, the number of stray dogs in the region has also increased rapidly.

Population control had consisted of the local authorities culling dogs by poisoning them to try and keep the numbers down. This is ineffective and brings protests from tourists, who do not want to see dead dogs on the streets.

In May, thanks to the support of The Sarojin, SDF started twice-monthly dog clinics with the co-operation of the local Tambon Administration Offices (OrBor-*Tor*), which provide the clinics and rabies vaccine, and a local school, which supplies accommodation for SDF's team.

Other hotels are also coming on board and Le Meridien Khao Lak now contributes to the costs of the operations. Dogs in need of more extensive treatment are transferred to the SDF shelter.

Both Sarojin general manager Leisa Kenny and Le Meridien general manager Martin Raich have noticed the difference. As well as sterilizing and vaccinating stray dogs and cats, local people also bring their animals in for surgery.

In June, SDF began a similar program on Koh Lanta, again with the financial backing of local businesses and the co-operation of the OrBorTor. The program should see virtually all the dogs on Lanta sterilized before December. With the

facilities to sterilize in excess of 10,000 dogs a year at its Mai Khao clinic, there is no reason why Phuket should have a stray dog problem for much longer.

However, with support coming from other locations, as well as rapidly increasing costs and donors having less disposable income in the current economic climate, this can only happen if more businesses follow the example of those mentioned above and understand that tourists will not want to visit an island overrun with stray dogs and cats.


Catching and sterilizing animals comes at a cost. SDF can do the work (nearly 20,000 dogs and cats have already been sterilized in the past five years), but only with the support of the local community.

In September, the Evason Phuket & Six Senses Spa in Rawai is sponsoring a fundraising evening for SDF at its Into the Beach venue.

Also sponsored by the Phuket Gazette, the event will raise much-needed funds for the SDF's sterilization program, which has recently expanded to other areas, including Koh Lanta, Khao Lak and elsewhere in the region.

The event will feature live entertainment and a disco, as well as sumptuous food and free-flow wine, beer and spirits all night. Tickets, at 2,000 baht, are limited and include free entry to a prize draw.

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# Pitfalls of smoking are a real drag

verybody knows that smoking is bad for you and can kill you. The world's public spaces, such as restaurants and bars, have gradually become smokefree areas. Smokers may be feeling a little unwanted or shunned. This is understandable since cigarettes are legal products.

However, smoking is a real problem and there are dangers associated with regular puffing on those "cancer sticks".

Among the many chemicals that flood your lungs with every puff, there are a few real nasties that can cause problems. The first is tar, a substance that coats the lungs and can cause lung and

throat cancer. A heavy smoker's lungs will be covered in tar. If squeezed, a thick dark flow of goolike gel would trickle out.

The second harmful chemical is carbon monoxide. The human body requires fresh oxygen in order to survive. For a person to top up on oxygen, he or she must breathe. Oxygen is then picked up by the blood via the lungs and pumped around the body by the heart to vital organs and muscles.

Carbon monoxide competes with oxygen in this process and, over time, causes airways to narrow and blood pressure to rise. This can lead to a heart attack, stroke or other circulatory problems

Third on the chemical hit list is nicotine, which, when inhaled, produces enhanced alertness and concentration, mild euphoria, feelings of relaxation and an in-

verybody knows that creased heart rate and blood pressmoking is bad for you sure.

Nicotine is addictive and difficult to quit, as any smoker will attest to. Although uncommon, it is possible to overdose on nicotine. Large doses can lead to feelings of faintness and confusion and a rapid decrease in blood pressure and breathing rate, eventually leading to convulsions and respiratory failure.

Smoking greatly increases the risk of dying from cardiovascular disease and accelerates decline in lung function. A smoker's lungs will be unable to send the same amount of oxygen to working muscles as a nonsmoker's. Smokers have a lower

uptake of oxygen and, therefore, lower levels of cardiovascular and aerobic fitness.

Fitness training can be difficult for smokers, particularly

in endurance activities such as swimming, running and cycling.

Passive smoking can also result in a number of health problems. Apart from irritation to the nose and eyes, there is a risk of lung cancer and cardiovascular disease.

If you are a smoker and you want to give up, explore all the options available to you. Start an exercise program and feel what it is like to once again breathe in fresh oxygen. Your body will thank

There are so many variables out there – talking toilets, Victorian washstands, Finnish saunas – that I bounce fretfully from choice to choice as if I was on something more than filter coffee.

### Revisiting the Reagan era

ean Wilentz has produced a massive tome of American political history called The Age of Reagan (HarperCollins, New York, 2008, 458pp), which covers the years from 1974 to 2008. His contention is that, just like the Age of Jackson or the Age of Roosevelt, Reagan's influence covered decades past his presidential terms, stretching from the Ford to the George W. Bush administra-

Reagan's political ideology was simple: cut taxes and the role of the Federal government while boosting military spending. Abroad, confront the Russian Evil Empire wherever it reared its ugly

"How successfully Reagan accomplished what he set out to do is one of this book's basic themes," Wilentz writes in his introduction. "Another theme concerns how much these successes and failures actually had to do with conservative ideology about supply-side economics and confronting the Soviet Union and its proxies around the globe (the heart of what became known as the Reagan Doctrine).

"The conclusions I have reached differ greatly from those advanced with increasing fervor in recent years by Reagan's admirers. They differ from those of his most vociferous critics. And they differ in several ways from the conclusions I would have expected myself to draw about Reagan's presidency and about much else



when I began work on this book several years ago."

Most valuable is the author's account of the rise of conservative ideology. Once considered a fringe movement with only a few respectable bastions like William F. Buckley's National Review magazine, conservatism came to dominate the national agenda.

As the Democrats disintegrated into squabbling special interest groups that helped doom Jimmy Carter's presidency, the Republicans were getting their act together. Think tanks, neoconservative magazines and radio shows, political action groups that brought together disaffected evangelicals, Southern resisters to school desegregation and the northern, largely Catholic working class, all came together in a movement that revolted against the excesses of the 1960s.

national power; instead it could engineer a corporate funded takeover that. in time, would turn the Republican Party into a wholly owned subsidiary of conservative movement," the author writes.

Wilentz quotes Reagan saying at the beginning of his term that his overall strategy derived from show business: create a great entrance. slack off a bit, then rally for a slam-bam finish. So his term turned out: initial years of great success in turning the country around, a nadir during the Iran-Contra scandal, and a rousing finish with his cooperation with Russia's Gorbachev to reach agreement and end the Cold War.

In the process, Reagan ditched his hard-line advisers for more moderate pragmatists – a process that would repeat

34 years of American policy making. Alas, too, he is not a particularly gifted writer. A long section on the Clinton years is just boring old news but is included to show how the conservative movement against him turned rancid, taken over by fierce, shrill, and often corrupt, ideologues.

To his credit, the author refuses to demonize nor canonize Ronald Reagan. His genius was his sunny good humor coupled with a shrewd pragmatism.

This was something he learned during his two terms as governor of California.

'Reagan displayed his greatest skills as a behind-the-scenes, bipartisan negotiator – listening as well as preaching, compromising when necessary with Democratic legislators, then taking the lion's share of credit for whatever was achieved."

This was a skill set, Wilentz notes, that Bush junior utterly failed to put to use, thus marking the end of the Age of Reagan.

hen speaking a new language, it's tough to kick the impulse to translate what you want to say from your moth-

When you're first learning, you're thinking of each sentence in English first. This can result in some pretty tortured Thai.

As you continue to improve, your speech patterns should start to sound more like a native speaker.

In achieving this, remember it's often the little things that count. Like prepositions: those words that pair up with a noun to tell us where things are, when something happens and so on.

Languages use prepositions slightly differently.

In English we're used to saying that we visited a friend on Sunday, but if we try to translate that into Thai using บน / bon, it sounds very silly. For Thais, you do things in a certain day. The same can apply to spatial descriptions. For example, in English we say the bird is *in* the sky, but that sounds silly in Thai.

Instead you have to say the bird is on (บน / bon) the sky.

There's plenty in common, too. Both English and Thai use "in" (lu /nai) for months and years. Thai for "in 2005..." would be: ในปี ๒๐๐๕ /nai pii sawng phan haa.

Let's have a look at some basic prepositions:

1. บน /bon "on (top of)", as in the book is on the table" หนังสืออยูบนโตะ /nangsue yuu

level of a house as บนบาน /bon baan/"on the house", a reference to the traditional Thai house built on stilts. You'll hear this even in Bangkok, where elegant stilt houses have given way to hulking cement monstrosities.

2. ln /tai "below, underneath", as in "the hammer is underneath the table": คอนอยูใตโตะ.

And the phrase ใต้โต๊ะ is also commonly used to mean illicit or secret dealings, probably from the English phrase "under the table". Also, the open-air area beneath a Thai stilt, house is called ใตถุน /tai thun. ใต /tai is also the word for "south".

3. เหนือ /nuea "above, over", as in "there's a spider hanging above the table" มีแมงมุมลอยอยูเหนือโตะ /mii maeng mum loi yuu nuea to.

Similar to ใต /tai, เหนือ / *nuea* is also the word for "north". But you'll see it in common phrases like เหนือหัว /nuea hua "overhead" (or the more polite version เหนือศีรษะ /nuea siisa),

and เหนือธรรมชาติ /nuea thammachaat "supernatural" (literally "over nature").

4. ขาง/khaang "beside, next to", as in, "the chair is next to the table": เกาอื่อยูขางโตะ /kao-ii yuu

You'll also see this word in phrases like ผลขางเคียง /phon khaang khiang "side effects" and เขาขาง /khao khaang "to take (a) side" in an argument.

5. ลาง/laang "bottom-most, lowest to the ground", as in: "His room is on the ground floor". หองของเขาอยูชั้นลาง /hawng khawng khao yuu chan laang.

Or if you drive a car in Thailand, you may have to fix the ชวงลาง /chuang laang, which is the "suspension", so-called because it's part of the underbody of the vehicle.

**6.** หนา /naa "in front of, front," as in: "The car is parked in front of the house". รถจอดอยูหนานาน /rot jawt yuu naa baan. หนา is also the word for "face".

The word หนา shows up all over the place; หัวหนา /hua naa "boss"; ลวงหนา /luang naa "ahead of time, in advance, early"; หนาตา /naa taa "appearance"; หนารถ /naa rot "hood (of a car)".

7. หลัง /lang "behind", as in "the keys fell behind the sofa": กุญแจหลนอยูขางหลังโซฟา /kunjae lon yuu khaang lang soofaa. หลัง is also the word for "back", as in ปวดหลัง /puat lang "backache".

You'll see หลัง /lang in expressions like: ที่หลัง /thii lang "later"; หลังจาก /lang jaak "after (in time)", ถอยหลัง /thoi lang "to reverse, move backwards", สันหลัง /san lang "spine, backbone".

You can also add the word ขาง "side" to the front of any of these, to be more specific. หนา / naa can mean a lot of things, but ขางหนา /khaang naa narrows it down to "in front of, ahead",

You can even say ขางขาง / khaang khaang. Repeating the word emphasizes that it's directly adjacent, to ,what you're describing: อยูขางขางดูเย็น /yuu khaang khaang tuu yen "it's right next to the fridge".

Paying close attention to how native speakers use these basic but important words can help your Thai immensely.

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#### Tourists are always the losers

The two-day closure of Phuket International Airport highlights the need for much better security at the airport, especially in the upcoming high season. The continuous and safe operation of the airport is absolutely vital not only to the Phuket economy, but Thailand as a whole.

Roughly a third of all tourists who come to Thailand – about 5 million annually – include Phuket in their travel plans.

Direct losses related to the closure have been estimated at about 250 million baht per day, but indirect losses throughout all levels of the economy and the damage to the island's reputation are far greater.

Perhaps most disappointing is the fact that despite all the talk by government officials about the superiority of the Thai brand of hospitality and the incessant knee-jerk comments about the need to promote and continually expand tourism, it is always the tourists who suffer the most.

It remains to be seen just how much of the Tourism and Sports Ministry's 400 million-baht "Tourist Fund" will actually make it into the hands of the scores of stranded tourists who need emergency accommodations and a way to get home after missing non-refundable connecting flights.

Imagine the stories now being told around the world about how once-in-a-lifetime holidays to paradise turned into complete nightmares, all because of the actions of a few hundred "agitators", combined with an unjustifiable lack of resolve on the part of "security forces" to stand up to them.

The police should review security footage and media images to identify these "agitators". Once identified, they should be arrested and charged and their relationships with the anti-government People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) or its archrival, the National United Front of Democracy Against Dictatorship (UDD), closely investigated.

While local PAD leaders held a press conference to distance themselves from these "mysterious" agitators, it is hard to believe they can claim no responsibility whatsoever when PAD leader Sondhi Limthongkul was quoted in the August 26 edition of the Bangkok Post as saying the PAD's "final war" against the Samak government would include instructing supporters to close both the Phuket and Haad Yai airports – which is exactly what happened.

Phuket has developed an almost legendary ability to bounce back from disasters, but it remains to be seen what the fallout from this latest, completely self-inflicted wound will be.

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

### Making the case for the Monkey Island project

t should come as no surprise when I say that it is not easy being a conservationist. Like the early pioneers in America, we invariably get scalped. The Monkey Island Project in Chalong (see Gazette, August 30 issue) appears to be no different. Sustainable use and conservation are easy topics to talk about, but putting sustainable use into practice invariably eludes the vast majority of people.

Monkey Island is a community-based, sustainable-use project designed to create broadbased awareness about the world's ecology and conservation, while simultaneously empowering the local community by allocating all the retail opportunities to them at no monetary cost.

Over and above the retail opportunities, the main crux of business to Monkey Island will be carried in the vessels of the existing Thai-owned speedboats and longtail boats, either as an add-on to their existing packages, or as a brand-new opportunity in the case of the longtail operators.


In addition comes a host of direct and indirect permanent work opportunities, ranging from monkey feeders, receptionists, marketing personnel, accounting and back office staff, boat operators (sewerage barge and security boats), security guards, cleaners, managers and up to 12 multilingual guides who will be spreading the conservation message in many languages.

Then there is the indirect employment flowing from the outsourcing of the monkey food preparation as well as accountants, auditors and attorneys. Add to this the procurement of everything from the food the monkeys eat to the paper used in the of-



fter years of Phuket pundits and top-end tourism figures calling for more sustainable tourism projects on the island, they might have just what they're looking for with the Monkey Island project in Chalong.

But is it true sustainable eco-tourism? Here, Tony Blignaut, CEO of Monkeyland Primate Sanctuary and Director of Touch a Monkey's Heart Foundation, puts forward his case for Koh Aew and Koh Tanan becoming monkey sanctuaries.

demics from every corner of the globe will come to study the primate populations that will be stationed there for conservation research purposes.

I envisage that the islands will fall under Touch a Monkeys Heart Foundation (TAMHF), a non-profit foundation that will work closely with an international university and a Thai university specializing in primatology.

Under these circumstances, Koh Aew would place Thailand at the very forefront of primate conservation in the world.

The credit for the existence

of this conservation milestone will accrue to the governor, the mayors and the other officials who make this project possible.

They are the ones who will be standing on the world stage, on CNN, BBC and in National Geographic, receiving the recognition they will rightfully deserve for having the foresight to allow this sanctuary here in Thailand, when Singapore, Cambodia and Vietnam are all jostling for it to happen in their country.

The other island in the project, Koh Tanan, would act as the "shop window" for the larger project, and since it is widely accepted in recent times that conservation needs to pay its own way if it is to be truly sustainable, Koh Tanan will be expected to do just that.

Situated in the eastern entrance to Chalong Bay, this tiny island will be host to a small population of about 30 individual monkeys, lemurs and apes made up of 15 species in pairs.

They will form the focal point of the attraction for tourists who will view the primates from the pier, while trained guides explain the characteristics of the various species to them.

As with Koh Aeaw, the island of Koh Tanan will not have any human footprint of any kind, just the 30 primates.

The only structure will be a wooden viewing pier with a floating docking jetty built below the high-water line. We have completed a comprehensive coral survey using a prominent marine expert at a Thai university, and it would appear that the pier and docking jetty will not affect any coral or sea grasses.

These findings are to be presented to the committee set up to consider the project, by Phuket Governor Niran Kalayanamit, in due course.

Besides the 40 novelty and refreshment outlets that would be owned and run by local community members, the pier will house toilet facilities.

I cannot over emphasize our policy on anti-pollution and respect for the environment.

The pier will be equipped with two barges, or motorized floating tanks, which will receive and transport the sewerage and gray water to the mainland, where it will either be pumped into the main sewerage system or taken directly to the plant by

truck. Garbage will also be taken off the pier and disposed of in an appropriate manner on the main-

This is not a casino project, it is a conservation and environmental education project where the main promoter is a non-profit foundation.

This means that the emphasis here is not on how much money can be hived off of the tourists, but rather on how effectively we can pass on environmental information that will hopefully play a meaningful role in the way people view and treat the environment and the creatures it supports in years to come.

Visitors to the project will arrive at a world-class activity by boat, either as part of a package involving Phi Phi or other islands, or as a stand-alone visitor using a longtail boat operator.

Arriving on the pier, visitors will be welcomed by our staff, exactly as we do at our South African sanctuary Monkeyland. From the pier, the furry inhabitants will be able to be observed with commentary from our guides who will have language skills and display the flags representing the countries of the languages they speak on their sleeves.

These guides will be passing on information about the primates in view, about the challenges these and other animal's face, about the habitat and the resources we all come into contact with on a daily basis.

The guides will be talking about the small things we can all do to make the planet a better place, like how best to sustainably use natural resources, and what not to do with the resources after we have used them.

As in the case of our flagship sanctuary in South Africa, the TAMHF will encourage school groups to visit the project. The same free access will be offered to handicapped people, old age homes and other special-care groups. Nobody is too young or to old to learn.

Bona-fide tourists visiting the island sanctuary will be charged a nominal fee, which will cover all the expenses, including those related to conservation research.

I would like to add, that this project has no known detrimental impacts on the environment or on communities.

To the contrary, it will benefit the people and communities by taking two unused islands and creating an attraction that will create ownership and jobs for the locals and additional business for existing businesses, increase tourism to Thailand and entrench the country as a leader in primate conservation and research.

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get a lot of questions both at the PC Group Therapy Meetings and via email. (Yes, I do answer all of my email, although sometimes it takes many weeks.) In this column I want to go through a bunch of questions that I've encountered recently that are of special interest to PC users in Phuket.

What is the best Internet connection right now?

There's no clear answer. People all over the island are posting their observed international Internet speeds at live-access.com/phuketinternet.aspx, and that's where you should go to see what everybody else is getting. (Continuing thanks to Henry Habermacher and X-NET Computer Peripherals Supply for maintaining that site. It's become a goldmine of information.)

In most parts of Phuket, if you can get TT&T to install a line with MaxNet Premiere, and if you don't mind spending 2,000 baht a month or so for unlimited service, that's your best bet. You can see full details in my August 23 *Phuket Gazette* article at tinyurl.com/66tt3l.

By the time you read this, I should have TT&T Premiere lines installed at my Sandwich Shoppes in Patong and Chalong, so you can drop by and test them yourself.

Unfortunately – and this is an increasingly common refrain

- TT&T says it can't install a line in Laguna/ Cherng Talay, so the Shoppe there will have to limp

along with CAT HiNet. I'll put together a side-by-side comparison for this column as soon as the lines are in and we have some experience with speeds.

If you want a wireless connection, the CAT EV-DO system is the hands-down winner. Although EV-DO only runs one-fifth as fast as TT&T's MaxNet Premiere, it's far faster than any other wireless connection.

Expect to pay 11,000 baht for the card and 800 baht a month for the service, which you can only get at the CAT office. See my July 11 column at tinyurl.com/6plk2c and my July 26 follow-up at tinyurl.com/5vbqzb for important details.

DTAC just announced that it will have "3G" service in Phuket by the middle of 2009. I'm skeptical for several reasons, but if DTAC can get HSDPA into Phuket – and backs it up with fast data pipes running overseas – we may see a big change coming in about a year. You can safely assume that DTAC will sell its own hardware, just like CAT, and it won't be cheap.

I still haven't heard anything about TOT's promise to have 3,200 fiber optic lines working by July of this year. On January 24, a *Gazette* article quoted a Phuket TOT official saying a 200-kilometer-long 1 Gbps FTTx system would be operational around the beginning of July. One has to wonder *which* July.

# You have questions? We've got answers

Is the Windows XP Service Pack 3 okay to install yet?

The short answer is "yes, maybe."

Windows XP Service Pack 3 is the final roll-up of Windows XP patches – Microsoft promises there won't be any more. Yes, security patches will continue to be issued (several every month, if the current trend continues), but after SP3 you have to download and install the patches one-by-one. SP3 also has support for several new kinds of hardware. But by and large, it's a yawner.

If you don't have a Microsoft-certified "genuine" copy of Windows XP, you should avoid Service Pack 3. It has at least two major new pirate-sniffing routines, and if your PC should run afoul of the "Genuine Advantage" detectors, you won't like the results: the next time you log on to Windows, your background turns black, and you see a watermark with a logo that says "Ask For Genuine Microsoft Software."

You can change your wall-paper, but every 60 minutes,

WinXP reaches out and turns it black again. That doesn't qualify as a debilitating takeover of your

machine. But it is a royal pain in the neck.

If you have a genuine copy of Windows XP, Service Pack 3 will probably go in very easily. There are a few niggling problems left, but the original big SP3 problems (specifically, an incompatibility with Microsoft's own Retail Management System) have been ironed out.



A bit of warning. If you use Norton SymProtect (gad, you don't pay for that junk, do you?), you need to read the advisory at tinyurl.com/5bwk33. If you have a broadband router manufactured by a company called Billion (I've never seen any in Thailand), you need to update your firmware; see tinyurl.com/5pvshq. And if you have an HP computer that uses an AMD processor, check out Jesper Johnasson's blog at tinyurl.com/6zs52d.

Is Windows Vista Service Pack 1 okay to install?

The short answer is, "yes, but make sure you have access to a different computer that's connected to the Internet." Microsoft has a very thorough set of upgrade instructions at support. microsoft.com/kb/936330. Read and follow them before installing Vista SP1.

In particular, note that anybody who upgrades to SP1 has access to unlimited, one-on-one free setup and compatibility support from Microsoft at support. Want to save a YouTube video? The downloader at downloader9.com saves Youtube videos as FLV files, which you can convert to other formats, or play directly.

microsoft.com/ph/11732. That's a first, as far as I know, and by all accounts the support is very good.

Like Windows XP SP3, Vista Service Pack

1 isn't a real big deal. Mostly it replaces the innards of Vista to make it more compatible with Microsoft's server software. But there are some improvements and fixes, and it's worth getting the new version if only to keep up with future security patches.

Sometimes I want to see a certain clip that is on Youtube, but I am busy with other things while I'm on the Internet. When I do get a chance to see it, I'm usually on the road without an Internet connection.

To be able to watch Youtube clips, I've started going to the clip,

downloading it, then putting the computer in the hibernate mode. Then I take the laptop with me, and I'm able to see it on the road even without an Internet connection

The problem is that every time that I do this, I get an error message that Internet Explorer will have to shut down, and I lose whatever clip I may have on there. If you know of any way to keep what was on my browser before it died somehow, that would also be extremely helpful.

A I'm not sure exactly why, but Internet Explorer is having a hard time storing the file. Firefox should do better. I hope.

You should be using Firefox anyway: it's faster, and much safer than Internet Explorer. Download Firefox at getfirefox. com and use it instead of IE for all of your surfing.

The best way to store Youtube files on your computer is to download the file directly using a service like the one www.downloader9.com offers.

You can then play the downloaded FLV file or convert it to some other format with the free apps at www.saveyoutube. com/youtube-flv-player-converter.htm

### Reproducing Chinese art decor

Khun Pongsapak is the son of former Phuket Senator Paiboon Upatising, who is currently president of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*).

K. Paiboon and his family are well known for their Phuket Villa housing developments in and

Prices for the units range from 3.4 million baht up to 7.2 million baht.

"There will be other facilities on site, such as a large 8m by 20m swimming pool, fitness center, car park in the basement, lobby and a management office," said K. Pongsapak.

"We are confident in our project as we are in a prime location near all the facilities that Patong has to offer. We are close to Jungceylon shopping mall and not far from Patong Beach.

"We have rental pool management on site and full hotel services available, which help owners who want to rent out their rooms, making these condos good investments.

"This has been one of the major selling points that has helped our project to sell very quickly," he added.

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
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

uch will be written in the coming days about the stunning effects of the sudden closure of the Phuket International Airport. As I type this, no doubt the latest news ages faster then a fine cheese left out in the tropical sun in our world of instant media.

As an observer of property and tourism, I have no intention to enter into or comment on the current state of political issues facing the country. I'm not a Thai national and frankly speaking it's a choice to live in a foreign country – expatriates learn to accept the good, the bad and the ugly that they encounter.

The events of August 29-31 have touched my life, my business and certainly have long-term implications for the future. In my own field of choice it's always important to keep a positive spin on downturns and crises no matter how severe. Damage control is an essential survival skill.

Over the past 12-18 months, with the coup, displacement of Thaksin, ongoing change of leadership and now the PAD action, here in Phuket the story has been, "In Phuket, things down here are different."

At times, while we are not entirely isolated from happenings in Bangkok, the most plausible pitch to tourists and investors alike has been through our doorto-door access from overseas, sending the message of relative calm on an island paradise.

However, in a single day, thise of us in Phuket were thrown into the eye of a storm that has made international headlines and has become a pawn in a much larger game of chess.

On Friday August 29, I was looking forward to a laid-back weekend; maybe going to see a movie and kicking back to enjoy a nice spate of sunny weather.

# Phuket rolls up the welcome mat

That came to a sudden halt as phone calls rolled in from a close friend in Sweden who owns a villa in Layan. He was flying in for his wife's birthday and to meet a group of business associates who had been prevented from entering the airport – unable to catch their flight to Singapore.

Next were the calls from some overseas investment firms who were scheduled with appointments early in the week asking for information.

Despite having lived on the island for seven years and having good hotel and other connections, it was amazing how little anyone knew or was able to ad-

I can only imagine the uncertainty of the tourists arriving and having to scale fences and plodding distances of more than

a kilometer down the beach with baggage or those scheduled to leave for home not knowing how or when they could leave.

Having lived in Asia for close to 23 years, I've lived through the People's Power movement, the ousting of Ferdinand Marcos, six coups during Cory Aquinos' tenure, the departure of strongman Suharto and Jakarta riots, Asian financial crises, a tsunami and while living in the highlands of Papua New Guinea, finding myself stuck in a hotel in the middle of tribal war – complete with flying arrows. Let's just say I have experienced many risky situations in other countries compared to the average tourist.

Speaking to the average tourist about the situation, words such as "civil war", "evacuation" and "perceived harm to family

members" were voiced by many. The tragedy of the matter was the lack of up-to-date information about the situation, be it from the TAT, Phuket International Airport authorities, the government or any formal body. Someone needed to take control of the situation and take care of the many visitors to our island. This was left to the private sector – to hotels and the service economy – who remain the unsung heroes of this

At a recent Raimon Land round-table function in Phuket that had a wide range of attendance from leading business and important Thai executives from Thai Airways, the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) and the Thai Hotel Association, one overriding sentiment on the key selling point of Phuket was the qual-

ity of hospitality.

At the end of the day "Thainess" is what draws people here, from the simple smiles, graciousness of our local hosts to world-class cuisine. It's easy to make Phuket your home. You feel wanted, cared for and relaxed.

While we keep making our hotels bigger, more upscale brands and ultra luxury products keep upping the ante. What fundamentally draws visitors and investors here is a unique and exotic culture with warm and friendly people.

What happened on August 29 runs counter to everything this island and tourism stand for, and for nearly two days, the welcome mats was rolled up. Just like the well-known lyrics from the classic Eagles song, Phuket became Hotel California – where you can check-in but can never leave...

As we move into high season, the increasing hotel and property supply needs stability and peace in order to erase the effects of a tarnished image.

Tourism is the number-one earner in Phuket, and the day-today livelihoods of the hospitality, service and property sectors run deep into every economic segment of the population.

Hopefully, there have been lessons learned and - as stated many times in this column – the need for a definitive provincewide dedicated visitors' body would go a long way to being able to actively engage the entire tourism infrastructure in crisies such as this.

As I finish writing this, the airport has been reopened. But at the same time, the Internet is buzzing with pictures of stranded tourists and angry visitors vowing never to return.

We've been damaged, but there remain the wonderful elements here that keep visitors and residents calling Phuket their place in the sun.

It's nice to have the welcome mat out again, but certainly some work is left to clean up the debris from the weekend's foray.
