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PAD protests to continue in Phuket

PHUKET CITY: Despite the Constitution Court on September 9 ordering Samak Sundaravej to resign his post as prime minister, the People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) in Phuket will continue its protest at Saphan Hin to add pressure for the coalition government to step down.

PAD Phuket leader Natjarong Ekpermsup told the *Gazette*, "The PAD will not leave Saphan Hin. Although Samak and his Cabinet must go, the government is a coalition with many corrupt members. We cannot accept a caretaker Prime Minister from Samak's coalition. Our country needs a neutral person to be PM, someone who can punish all those who have done wrong.

wrong. "We will be watching the five PAD leaders on ASTV at Saphan Hin every night for direction. If the rest of the Cabinet must be put under pressure [to resign], then we will help add to that pressure," he said.

"Banharn Silpa-archa would not be acceptable to us as prime minister because he does not know how to keep his word. He made a lot of promises before joining the coalition, afterwards he did not do anything," he added.

The local PAD protest had gained support from students on Phuket, with some 3,000 secondary students from Phuket Wittayalai School marching from Phuket Provincial Hall to Saphan Hin on September 9 to show their support for the anti-government PAD protest.

Nationwide, some 80 universities staged similar anti-government protests the same day. The marchers proceeded

slowly around Surin Circle and down Phuket Rd to Saphan Hin, where the PAD protesters had returned and set up a stage after their occupation of the grounds of Phuket Provincial Hall a week earlier.

The group was led by about 200 students on motorcycles, most of whom opted not to wear crash helmets.

Unlike many of the older PAD supporters, many of the Phuket Wittayalai School students were able to express their displeasure at the current administration in English.

"We are protesting because Samak is selling our country to foreigners," one schoolgirl said.

Phuket City Police Superintendent Nos Svettalekha was among the very few uniformed police officers monitoring the procession as it rounded Surin Circle. The students were polite, drove slowly and rejoiced cheerfully as they expressed their dislike for Samak, observers noted.

After arriving at the PAD protest area at Saphan Hin, some of the students took to the stage, marched around with megaphones or made phone calls, successfully urging some 4,000 students from Satree Phuket School to join the protest.

Students from two vocational schools in the city were also mobilized to join the protest.

However, after national media announced the Constitution Court's decision that afternoon, most of the students disbanded and headed home.

"The students at Saphan Hin were so delighted with the news that the court had made a unanimous 9-0 decision, they decided to home," Mr Natjarong said.

Memorial service for One-Two-Go victims

MAI KHAO: To mark the oneyear anniversary of the One-Two-Go flight OG 269 tragedy and to honor its victims, there will be a memorial service on Mai Khao Beach, near the end of the runway, at 3 pm on Tuesday, September 16.

Some spirit houses have already been installed at the service site, and Christy Sweet will be putting one more spirit house there on the day.

There will be a Buddhist service during the placement of the spirit house and a reading of the names of those who perished in the disaster.

Christy Sweet is organizing the activity on behalf of Bonnie Rind, sister to one of those who died in the accident and publisher of InvestigateUdom.com, a website that aims to have One-Two-Go and Orient Thai Airlines owner Udom Tatiprosongchai brought to trial over the air crash.

"One-Two-Go staff will be arranging the monks for the ceremony," Ms Sweet said.

However, One-Two-Go will not be holding a memorial service of their own this year. Somjai Krongsuksan, secretary to Mr Udom, said: "Last year, we invited the families of all the victims to a ceremony, but this year we are not arranging anything."

Phuket International Airport Director Vicha Nernlop said, "We've heard nothing about the ceremony and we had no intention of organizing one ourselves, because not everyone likes to be reminded about tragedies like that.

"Of course, if there are people who would like to organize such a ceremony, then they could contact us and we would help out to ensure that it runs smoothly."

1,453 pills of seized in ya bah busts

PHUKET CITY: Police arrested five men and seized 1,453 ya bah (methamphetamine) pills and two firearms in a series of arrests starting early on September 4.

Seeing two men busy repairing motorcycles in front of their home in Srisuchart Grandview Village in Rassada at 3:30 am, police searched Theerawat Toh-Mad, 26, and Surasak Anantakan, 25.

After finding them in possession of 22 ya bah pills and 13,800 baht in cash, they searched the house and uncovered an unregistered semi-automatic 9mm pistol with ammunition, police said.

The pair named as their supplier Saran "Bung-Od" Pu-Nguen, 43, who was arrested in a sting operation at the Phuket Garden Hotel on Bangkok

Rd in Phuket City at 1 pm the same day. A search of Saran and his car uncovered 90 more ya bah pills and a loaded .38 pistol, police said.

He confessed to drug and firearms charges, said police, and told officers there was a stash of drugs in Room 202 of The Royal Residence Hotel, where police a few hours later arrested Phuket native Anan "Nok" Kaewprasert, 35, and seized 52,000 baht in cash and 1,340 more ya bah pills.

Anan in turn identified his supplier as Jarin "Rarin" Pongmak, 36, but a search of Jarin's room at Suksomboon Apartments in Poonphol Night Plaza uncovered a single *ya bah* pill.

All five were charged with possession of ya bah with intent to sell, while three of the suspects were also charged with offenses related to illegal possession of firearms.

Major blackouts announced

PHUKET: The Phuket Provincial Electricity Authority (PPEA) has announced scheduled blackouts in order to continue its work on high-voltage power lines.

The blackouts, which will occur from 9 am to 5 pm, will affect the following populated areas:

September 17, Rawai: east side of Wiset Rd, from opposite Muang Phuket School to Saiyuan Rd, including Soi Muang Phuket, Fisherman Way housing estate, Soi Baan Bang Kontee and Soi Ruamjai.

September 24, Phuket City: south side of Yaowarat Rd, from Soi Panieng to Songkhla Rd, including Tessabaan Samkong School, some parts of Phuket Villa 1 and Yaowarat Sois 2 and 3.

September 26, Chalong: west side of Chao Fa West Rd, from the PPEA substation to opposite Wat Chalong, including Soi Nakok, Chaofa Thani housing estate and Soi Sainamyen Chalong.

Island flooding prompts landslide warning

PHUKET: Heavy rains all day on September 5 caused flooding at many locales around the island, causing long tailbacks along major roads and damage to shops inundated with water.

Patong suffered minor floods in the morning before the rain stopped to give the resort town a midday reprieve, but only for the skies to open yet again in the afternoon and cause more flooding.

Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd saw long tailbacks from Soi Bangla back to Baan Sai Nam Yen School. On Sirirat Rd, at the southern end of Patong, one shop staffer told the Gazette that it took an hour to clear out the floodwater from his shop in the morning, only to see the shop flood again after just 30 minutes of rain that afternoon.

Patong Municipality workers spent an hour clearing drains at the intersection at the bottom

of the hill so that the floodwaters would subside.

The Thai Meteorological Department center in Phuket City recorded rainfall of 34.7 millimeters between 1 pm and 3 pm.

In Chalong, runoff from nearby hills caused flooding across Chao Fa West Rd in front of the Phuket Provincial Electricity substation.

Nearby shophouses were inundated, with staff at TTT Furnishings store saying that it was the first time that shop had been flooded. "Normally, only the road floods, but today it's not even heavy rain and the shop flooded after it had been raining for only

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an hour," said one staffer.

Heavy showers continued during the following days, leading the Meteorological Department to issue a flash flood warning for seven provinces, including Phuket, on September 8.

Wiwat Intarapanich, Chief of Weather Forecasting at the Meteorological Department office near the airport, reminded the Gazette that September is statistically the rainiest month in Phuket, with an rainfall averaging about 400 millimeters.

He warned of landslides, especially in areas of hillside construction and illegal encroachment on forest land.

7-Eleven robbers make clean getaway

PHUKET CITY: Police are still searching for leads that may result in the arrest of two men who held up the 7-Eleven store opposite Prompan shopping center on Chao Fa West Rd at gunpoint on September 7.

Phuket City Police received a call reporting the robbery around 2 am. The caller told police that two armed men in fullface helmets had stolen just over 1,000 baht from the store before fleeing on a motorcycle.

"This will be a hard case to crack. Both the girls who work in the store have no recollection of the motorbike's color, let alone the license plate number.

"We understand that the excitement and shock of the robbery has made it difficult for them to remember details," Lt Col Wijak Tarom of Phuket City Police told the *Gazette*.

"They were able to tell me that the two men spoke to each other in a southern dialect, wore full-face helmets and pointed a gun at them before getting on their bike and speeding away," he added.

Lt Col Vijak Tarom told the Gazette, "There were no eyewitnesses and on top of that the store does not have a closed-circuit television (CCTV) system. CCTV serves as both a deterrent and a source of evidence."

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

Navy plans for medivac helipads

PHUKET CITY: The Royal Thai Navy's Third Fleet wants to build a network of helicopter landing pads on outlying islands so that tourists needing emergency medical treatment can be brought back to Phuket faster.

Rear-Admiral Supot Pruksa of the Third Naval Area Command announced the initiative on September 4, following his opening address at a two-day maritime safety meeting attended by 60 naval officers at the Phuket Merlin Hotel.

All attendees at the seminar are based in the six Andaman Coast provinces that comprise the Third Area Command, centered at the naval base at Cape Panwa.

The meeting was held to update officers on progress made and integrating procedures of the Third Fleet's five-year Maritime Safety Plan, launched in 2006.

Navy efforts to increase tourist safety in the Andaman region came after the 2004 tsunami, when staff and new facilities were established in Patong, on Koh Lanta Noi in Krabi and at both the Similan and Surin archipelagos off the coasts of Phang Nga and Ranong.

Citing the example of a Russian tourist who was airlifted to Phuket after being bitten by a fish while diving off the Similans in May last year, R/Adm Supot said that setting up landing pads for helicopters was the next logical step in the safety plan.

One landing pad has been built at Surin Islands, but additional landing pads are needed there and at other popular tourist destinations, including the Similans and Koh Lanta Noi, he said

However, the National Parks officials responsible for these islands have been reluctant to allow more than 300 square meters of park land to be covered with asphalt to accommodate the 20-meter-diameter landing pads, he added.

"They say it will hurt the environment and destroy the scenery, but I think it is worth it in order improve our emergency response capacity," he said.

The cost of each landing pad, about 60,000 baht, would be covered by the Navy, he said.

The Navy has permission to build a helipad at Similan Island 8, but would prefer to site the helipad on Island 4, which is visited by many more tourists.

"We are in disagreement with them over that, but in the end I hope we can build it there. We would build it in an area that would not block beautiful views," he said.

If the emergency helipad project is successful, injured tourists could be airlifted to Phuket in just 20 minutes, he said.

Getting injured tourists back to Phuket from the Similans can take up to four hours when seas are heavy, he added.

dence of people going home or running away," he said.

Both Thai AirAsia and THAI Airways have reaped the benefits of One-Two-Go and Nok Air's misfortunes with higher passenger and cargo loads, after One-Two-Go was grounded by the government pending safety improvements and Nok Air cut its Phuket service to two weekend flights due to a fall in demand.

In contrast, Thai AirAsia currently has 10 flights a day into Phuket, including two from Kuala Lumpur and one from Singapore. AirAsia flies 656 flights daily, on 102 routes to 57

destinations in 12 countries.

Mr Fernandes, who is famously outspoken, had harsh words for the Airports Authority Of Thailand, which runs six airports in Thailand, including Phuket International Airport.

He did not directly criticize the authorities who run PIA, but did say that Thailand is definitely falling behind other prime tourist destinations because of the AOT's reluctance to reduce current landing charges that are among the highest in Asia. He called the AOT "rudderless".

"We have delivered for them. We are the only airline to remain and not cut flights. In fact, we have added capacity into Phuket," he said.

Brit dies in smash on slippery road to Rawai

RAWAI: An Englishman died of injuries sustained in a high-speed crash on a curve on Wiset Rd early on September 6.

Capt Tienchai Duangsuwan of Chalong Police identified the victim as Mark Anthony Crosby, age 43.

Mr Crosby had been drinking with his father in Rawai earlier that night, Capt Tienchai said, adding that the accident occurred after Mr Crosby had driven his father to his home in Phuket City.

Tread marks on the road indicated the car he was driving skidded some 30 meters before crashing near the entrance to Vighit Bungalow Resort at about 1:45 am.

"We found Mr Crosby with 3,700 baht on his person and he was wearing a diamond ring. There is a sharp curve along that section of the road that he might not have been familiar with," Capt Tienchai said, adding that the British Embassy had been informed of the accident.


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hen a convoy of four disassembled Douglas C-47 Dakota Skytrain and six Sikorsky S-58T helicopters rolled across the Sarasin Bridge on 15 flatbed trucks on April 20 this year it was quite spectacle.

Finally making it onto Phuket marked the beginning of the end of a considerable amount of work for Bangkok-based international freight forwarding firm Cargo Marketing International Co Ltd (CMI), which was contracted to disassemble the aircraft from Koke Kratiem Airforce Base and transport them overland more than 1,000 kilometers to the Phuket Deep Sea Port at Cape Panwa.

From there, the aircraft would be chained to concrete blocks, placed upon barges and sent to a carefully selected site in Bang Tao Bay.

Once there, the aircraft would be carefully lowered onto the seabed in a concentric pattern to become the first dive site of its type in Thailand.

Project organizers For Sea Foundation and the Thai Dive Association hoped the site would become an important new dive tourism attraction, the first of many artificial reefs along the Andaman Coast that would take some pressure off existing, natural dive sites.

Although the organizers had obtained some 4 million baht for the project from the Cherng Talay lay, CMI Managing Director been paid, as his understanding

he rush to sink 10 Cold War-era aircraft in Bang Tao Bay on May 5 to create an artificial reef was abandoned at the last minute due to stormy conditions and heavy seas.

Some four months later, however, the project organizers were called to an August 19 meeting at Phuket Provincial Hall. The manager of the transport company that delivered the aircraft to Phuket from Lopburi was threatening to sue over non-payment for work completed four months before.

Here, Gazette News Editor Stephen Fein and reporter Pathomporn Kaenkrachang delve into the nonpayment issue and update the future of the "Coral Reef Squadron".

Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor) and more from private donations, when CMI's 2.4-million-baht bill for its work reached the TDA, some of its board members were surprised at what they considered an inexplicably high total and demanded to see itemized details of the invoice accounting.

Four months later, TDA representatives still hadn't signed off on the payment, trying in vain to negotiate with CMI to lower it.

Getting fed up with the de-

Chuchard Santikanant finally made a formal complaint to the Phuket Provincial Office, threatening a lawsuit if payment was not made by the end of the month.

To work out a solution, all the parties were called to a special meeting at Phuket Provincial Hall on August 19. The meeting was chaired by Phuket Vice-Governor Worapoj Rattha-

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was that the whole transport phase of the project had been completed.

TDA President Jindapon explained to the vice-governor that consultation with two private transport companies indicated that the bill was excessive, but said that the TDA had the funds and was willing to pay the invoice as long as the vice-governor signed off on it as a new board member, since the money of taxpayers in Cherng Talay was being used.

The payment finally authorized after V/Gov Worrapoj named a new project board headed by Phuket Office of Sports and Recreation Development Director Promchote Traivate, and the new board approved payment by August 29.

The Gazette contacted CMI's Mr Chuchard several times to see if and when he had

finally received payment. At last report, CMI was to send an authorized representative with a signed power of attorney document to receive the funds on September 10, he said.

"But until the money is actually in the bank, I won't believe it," he said.

For some extra clarification on why it had taken CMI so long to get paid, the *Gazette* contacted Rainer Gottwald, who is president of the TDA's technical committee and a big proponent of artificial reef construction.

The TDA had actually played no role in the original budget calculation, which he said he thought was made though a private firm in Bangkok named Seal Stone Supply and Services Ltd Partnership, he said.

The TDA is still trying to figure out exactly what happened, as the TDA President wants the whole matter to be 100% transparent. As a non-profit organization, the TDA tried to do everything possible to complete the project on a volunteer basis at a minimum possible cost, he said

The payment issue took the organization by surprise and has already cost one former board member his membership in the organization, he added.

"The TDA checked the numbers with other transport companies, just to have a look if the numbers they gave to us were really clear. And there were some difficulties in understanding why the transporter was asking for so much money for each truck and for cranes...

"According to what I understood, there were more trucks on the list than were actually needed and cranes on the invoice that were not used over the mentioned period of time," he said.

Only four "extra heavy duty" trucks were used [to carry the Dakota fuselages], and that the rest of the work was done by smaller flatbeds whose service could and should have been contracted at a much lower rate, he said.

"The TDA wants to be involved in environmental projects and reef restoration, rebuilding coral, but not in paying of fees that we are not really 100% sure about. People might start asking us, 'hey, what happened to the money?'

"But the TDA only presented the project, not the prices. The prices were made by other people... But the contractor refused to go down a single baht, saying he had completed the work." The TDA had learned its lesson this time around and will put much greater scrutiny on financial affairs in future artificial reef projects.

"In future artificial reef projects, we will definitely calculate every satang of every liter of diesel that is used. We are refusing to support using privatesector parties getting benefits from projects like this, which is meant to be non-profit," he said.

Mr Promchote told the *Gazette* on August 26, "We are working on the case and will clear the file and sign approval for the money next week and we will plan for this big event to continue in November.

come the largest artificial reef in Thailand.

Now that the thorny transport payment issue has apparently been settled, the TDA is now looking forward to working with its partners to submerge the Coral Reef Squadron.

The Army has also agreed to give over more old military hardware to help the TDA realize its goals to create the country's largest artificial reef, which will now include some "ground support" in the form of four very large WW2-Era GMC army trucks, donated by the Royal Thai Army. They are now being cleaned in preparation for the drop.

On the technical aspects of the reef drop, Mr Gottwald explained that all the aircraft will be sunk from the barge onto "neutral ground", meaning an area of the seabed that has been documented as being free of existing coral and other marine life.

"We have the GPS co-ordinates. The TDA and the Royal Thai navy Seals will conduct the operations, keeping the roles of private contractors to an absolute minimum. We will have to pay for the barge and the crane but most of the work is being done on a volunteer basis," he said.

"This artificial reef was first offered to Koh Racha Yai, but no *OrBorTor* wanted it. Finally, Cherng Talay *OrBorTor* decided to take it on as a way of giving something back to nature after the dramatic toll that real-estate development along Bang Tao Beach had taken on local coral reserves there.

"They decided to fund and support the project as a way of giving something back to the environment," he added.



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Death and rebirth, minus all the bad karma - in just five min-

Morning of the living dead

NAKHON RATCHASIMA: took about five minutes. Anyone calling in to Wat Pa Satharuam on August 22 could be forgiven for thinking they'd stumbled upon the aftermath of a natural disaster, seeing row after row of coffins lined up on the the temple grounds.

Anyone waiting a little longer, however, would get even more of a shock when, after watching the death rites, the occupants of the 59 coffins began to rise up as if returning from the dead.

The scene was not some voodoo ritual, but a ceremony to rid the faithful of curses and bad karma from previous existences.

From 8 am to 1 pm, participants took turns climbing into the coffins with a bunch of flowers, incense and a candle. They lay down facing west, and monks covered them with shrouds.

Four monks then paraded around the coffins, murmuring incantations and sprinkling holy water from 108 famous temples on the bodies.

Finally, the coffins' occupants faced east, thus completing their rebirth. The whole process

Chamlong Kanchanawatana of the organizing committee said, "The ceremony of cleansing bad luck by lying in coffins is an ancient belief. If someone has misfortune, bad karma, obstacles or problems in their lives, then [the ceremony] will bring them good fortune, driving problems and danger out of their lives. It is like death and rebirth, except that all the bad things die along with the old person.'

Wichai Nanthathanathawon, Chairman of the Bangkok-Nakhon Rachasima Friendship Group, which organized the ceremony, said this was the ninth year the ceremony had been held. It was the biggest yet and the largest of its type in the world.

This year it would be particularly auspicious for women born in the year of the goat, dog, ox and snake. Men born in the year of the horse, rabbit, rat and cock would also benefit as, according to astrologers, the Chinese New Year that began on February 8 is not a good time for them, Mr Wichai explained.

DOCUMENT FORGERY DETECTION: May I see your passport, sir?

PHUKET CITY: Immigration officers from throughout Southern Thailand converged at the Phuket Immigration Office at Saphan Hin from August 25 to September 4 to attend courses in identifying forged documents, such as passports and other forms of identification, as part the Immigration Bureau's plan to upskill its officers.

The courses were conducted with the help of the Visa and Immigration Section of the Australian Embassy in Bangkok to show the continuing close cooperation between the Australian and Thai governments in border management.

Glyn Ruddell, First Secretary Immigration Compliance at the Australian Embassy, told the Gazette, "The Australian embassy has in past years organized training courses for officers in Phuket and it is a very convenient location. The training was for 75 people, but some of the officers who work at Saphan Hin that were not officially enrolled also came along to join."

Phuket Immigration chief Col Chanatpol Yongbunjerd explained, "The Immigration headquarters for the Southern Region are in Haad Yai, but Phuket was chosen as a more suitable location for the training as Phuket now has new offices at Saphan Hin and the meeting room on the third floor is appropriate for workshops and training sessions

"Some officers came down from Ranong, and the rest of the officers from the Ranong office who could not make it down to Phuket will be sent up to [Im-

migration headquarters] at Suan Plu in Bangkok to receive the training," he added.

As with many criminal activities, methods of production and distribution of forged documents are becoming increasingly sophisticated – particularly with identity fraud. It is therefore critical that law-enforcement officers are trained to detect forged documents as they are often used by criminals engaged in many different types of crime, such as human trafficking, terrorism and drug smuggling.

Two Australian Forensic Document specialists - one based in the Philippines and the other from Canberra – presented the training, which focused on improving the skills of the officers in detecting forged documents, such as passports and other identity documents.

"The techniques taught officers to not only identify forged or altered passports, but also forged visas or stamps in a passport. Other forms of supporting identification, such as driving licenses or ID cards, can also be checked for irregularities," said Col Chanatpol.

"The combination of trained officers, specialized equipment, access to forensic expertise and up-to-date intelligence, the effective use of automated support systems and effective internal procedures are all standards that should be considered for incorporation our new strategic immigration plan," he added.

Each officer was presented with a kit containing equipment to check the authenticity of documents. "The training kit given to the officers included an eyeglass, an ultraviolet lamp and a retro-reflective viewer." said Mr Ruddell.

"The course was effective because a hands-on approach was used. The exercise where each officer had to separate mixed-up piles of real and forged documents was a great confidence





ore than 50% of foreign visitors view the recent clashes between pro- and anti-government demonstrators as "normal" in a democratic system, an ABAC poll has found.

Although recent clashes led to Prime Minister Samak Sundaravej declaring a state of emergency in Bangkok, most foreign visitors said they were happy about their trips and would return.

Poll director Noppadon Kannika said the September 2-5 survey questioned 532 foreign tourists and businesspeople in Thailand and found most knew about the street riots and emergency declaration.

Almost 60% viewed the incidents as normal in a democratic system, while 49% said they were affected by the protests, including travel-plan disruptions due to airport closures and railway strikes.

However, they were generally satisfied with Thailand, including the culture, food, tourist attractions as well as safety of life and property. They were less satisfied about politics, economy and social justice.

About 97% said they will visit again despite the recent incidents and 99% said they would encourage others to visit Thailand, he said.

Mr Noppadon said these visitors had probably seen activists in other countries and believed the political turmoil here would end peacefully because the riots had stopped.

Beggar brigadiers. Agents are recruiting elderly people and children from villages in Isarn to become Bangkok beggars for incomes of up to 15,000 baht per family per month, the Mirror Foundation revealed on September 7.

Ekkalak Lumchomkae, head of the foundation's Operation Center against Human Trafficking, said a field study by his office found that some dealers were collecting transport and accommodation fees from villagers.

They rented a house in Bangkok's Bang Sue district for these people so that they could beg for money, especially from

shoppers at Chatuchak Weekend Market.

Recruits included not only the poor, but members of a village headman's family and relatives of tambon administrative organization members, the report revealed.

During school terms, youngsters would travel to Bangkok to beg on Friday evening and return home on Sunday, staying in Bangkok throughout school holidays, he said.

Mr Ekkalak said he was not sure if the Cabinet-approved draft legislation on beggars to replace the outdated 1941 Begging Control Act would violate people's rights.

The new measures could label some people as beggars, creating a loophole for human traffickers to have people registered as legalized beggars with local administrative organizations.

Malpractice misery. Doctors and medical workers nationwide are feeling increasingly depressed and even suicidal after receiving lawsuits for medical malpractice, according to the Medical Council.

Council President Dr Somsak Lohlekha said many doctors who were being sued faced serious health problems, depression and felt dissociated from their communities and social context, while others had committed suicide.

Many doctors had changed their careers to avoid lawsuits, he added.

Others treat only outpatients and will not treat inpatients with complicated symptoms. Some tell their children not to study to become a doctor, he said. Citing recent Public Health

Ministry records, about 75 medical malpractice cases are filed annually against doctors, while the Medical Council's records from 1991 to 2007 show that about 2,880 doctors have been the subject of complaints.

Doctors, especially in rural areas, will not provide treatment to certain patients as a safeguard against receiving a lawsuit, said the council's deputy secretarygeneral.

Most doctors lack knowledge about the process to handle the problem and do not have legal advisers, he added.

The Council is planning to set up medical associations across the country in a bid to resolve conflicts between doctors and patients.

As the recently imposed 2008 Procedural Act for Consumer Protection Cases will affect doctors, the associations will also provide doctors with legal training so that they are in a better position to resolve problems by themselves.

Park pillage. Scientists are calling for a review of the government policy that allows private investment in national parks.

Marine Science Association of Thailand chairman Padermsak Jarayabhand said such investment is against the principles of establishing the national parks.

The 150-member association will ask the National Park, Wildlife and Plant Conservation Department to demand that it review the controversial policy.

Natural Resources and Environment Minister Anongwan Thepsuthin has encouraged private investment in national parks, believing that it will enhance tourism and the overall economy.

"If the government wants private investors to play a role, clear-cut regulations and procedures must be laid down or else natural-resource problems will arise," he said.

Citing the case of Ao Keuk at the Similan Islands, Prince of Songkla University lecturer Sakanan Plathong said coral reefs were particularly at risk.

The policy to invite private investors into national parks might prejudice the plan to seek World Heritage status for the Andaman Sea, he added.

Songkhla suffers spate of killings

uspected insurgents shot dead a teacher from the government non-formal education system on September 2 as he was riding a motorbike in Krong Pinang District, one of the most contested areas in the Deep South.

Tosatit Samithamuksik, 48, who worked at an education center in Krong Pinang, was shot several times at close range in the torso. He died on the way to hospital.

Ridding pillion with Khun Tosatit was his wife, Nithaya Wonglakorn, who escaped unharmed. The two were returning home from the education center.

The attack followed a weekend of continued violence that saw four people, including a police officer, shot dead in suspected separatist attacks.

Police said a 43-year-old border patrol policeman was shot dead late in the afternoon of August 31 in Pattani, while a 52year-old Buddhist woman, and a 49-year-old Muslim man, were both killed in fatal drive-by shootings on the morning of September 1 in the same province.

The evening of August 31 also saw a 50-year-old Muslim village leader shot dead by an unknown gunman.

The spate of killings came as southern Thailand began observing Ramadan, the month when the faithful fast from sunrise to sunset.

Final ride. An employee at the Krabi branch of the Saengrung Phuket Company Hino Truck dealership was shot dead outside his office on September 1.

The victim, 30-year-old Sommai Khuantai, was blasted in the face with a shotgun after getting out of a six-wheeled company truck that he had parked outside

the office in Tambon Krabi Yai. Rescue workers rushed him

to hospital, where he later died of his injuries. Police believe K. Sommai

was killed over a dispute involving his younger brother, who was shot dead a month earlier. K. Sommai had allegedly been threatening to go after his brother's killers, which is likely to have provided a motive for them to kill him first, police said.

Healthy village. Kor Tang Village in Krabi's Khao Phanom district has established itself as a "Model for Tambon-level Public Health", a Krabi Public Health official has announced.

Wiraphan Nuansri of the Krabi Health Office and head of Ban Kor Tang Community Health Center in Tambon Khao Din, chaired a ceremony to launch the initiative on September 1.

K. Wiraphan explained that the project involved encouraging all tambon-level organizations to work together in promoting healthy living.

The project would serve as a model for the creation of tambon-level health organizations, which would provide high-

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quality primary care for villagers and limit the number of visits to district hospitals.

"Each month, at least 1,500 people come to use our health services, which cover nine villages with a total population of 9,012. We now have 49 village volunteers who work together with Ban Kor Tang Community Health Center to promote public health," K. Wiraphan said.

Saved by the mobs. The Prince of Songkla University has postponed mid-term exams to allow students, lecturers and staff to take part in "people politics" to help "resolve" the current political crisis, the university rector said.

Assoc Prof Dr Boonsom Siribamrunsuk on September 3 said the university management, the council of lecturers and council of university officials agreed that mid-term exams should be postponed and that all university personnel should contribute to the 'people's sector" politics.

The university, which called on the government to lift the state of emergency in Bangkok, asked the government to resign or dissolve the House of Representatives.

More than 3,000 students joined a peaceful protest in Songkhla calling for Prime Minister Samak Sundaravej to resign or dissolve the House of Representatives.

Students from Nakhon Sri Thammarat Rajabhat University and Walailak University, both also in Sonkhla, joined the People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) movement to block a road in front of Nakhon Si Thammarat City Hall.

Many officials in the hall were seen cheering PAD supporters.

Village defense. Narathiwat Provincial Vice-Governor Pradit Suknathasawat on August 31 announced the opening of a new scheme designed to help villages in the South defend themselves from insurgents - and earn extra income at the same time.

V/Gov Pradit presided over a ceremony to mark the founding of Ban Thon Chalermprakiat in the playing field of Ban Thon School in Village 5, Tambon Khok Khian, Muang district.

The park will be used to train around 1,000 villagers to work in shifts to defend public buildings, such as the village school and health center, K. Pradit explained.

Women and youths from the village will also be given lessons in handicrafts such as bag weaving and model-ship building, to help them earn more income, he added.

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There's nothing like zipping along at speeds of over 100 kilometers an hour with your backside just a few inches above the tarmac to get the adrenalin going. Your heart rate accelerates as you near the hairpin bend, gripping the wheel even tighter as it shakes, knowing that misjudging the corner could see you spin out and lose your hairbreadth's lead.

Your teammates cheer from the pits as you successfully negotiate the bend, picking up speed as you exit the curve.

But you only have a second to think about your next move because that new guy in your office has caught up with you on the corner by taking the inside and he's threatening to overtake, so you maneuver to block him. But what's this? That girl at work who you're always trying to impress drives like she was born in a go-kart and comes roaring past the pair of you to take the lead.

The rivalry is real, but it's all in good spirits at Patong Go-Kart Speedway as colleagues battle it out on the race track in an all-day corporate team-building Grand Prix.

Last week, about 100 regional employees of HotelTravel. com gathered at the track, which has been designed in line with UK National Karting Association standards.

The fleet of karts are also built and maintained to equally high standards.

Kart racers can be as young as eight years old, but they must be at least 1.25 meters tall to be allowed to race. The fleet at the speedway is made up of karts for different kinds of drivers.

For kids there are karts with 140cc engines restricted to a maximum speed of 40kmh. Then

there's the 270cc double-seater karts so dad can drive and give son a safe taste of the thrill at a maximum speed of 60 kmh.

Next up the power chart are the standard karts. These have 200cc engines and can also reach 60kmh, but best of all are the race karts, which can reach a top speed of 110kmh with their powerful 400cc engines.

For corporate team-building events at the speedway, teams of five people or more are put through a mini Grand Prix – a series of races that pits teams against each other to compete in a final 10-lap race, which decide the winning team and the overall individual winner for the day, who is given the checkered flag to parade around the track for a victory lap.

Then the podium comes out, a wreath is hung over the winner's neck and a bottle of bubbly is cracked open for the traditional "champagne spray". Frontman for HotelTravel.com, Canadian Blair Speers, said that corporate team building days are regular events for his staff and that the mini Grand Prix is a fun way to foster team spirit and inter-branch relations.

"Every one of the staff members racing here today is someone unique and special to the company and it's important to show how much they are appreciated.

These regular team-building events are part of the reason we enjoy zero turnover among our staff. No one has left the company since they joined," he said. "Today's mini Grand Prix

has been a great way for people who work together to get to know each other a little better. Many of them will have


met for the first time today because they work in different offices all over the region and will have been communicating with each other by phone or the Internet, but may never have spoken face to face," he added.

Englishman John Davenport, who oversees operations at the speedway and has run several go-kart tracks in the UK, is on hand during team-building events to ensure that the karts, track and patrons are well maintained. He briefs the drivers on how to handle their karts and the track and sometimes gives running commentary by megaphone as the karters do their laps.

"I used to do a lot of corporate events back in the UK and it has really caught on here, too. We're open seven days a week and on most days, people can 'arrive and drive' as long as they meet the age and height requirements, but we close the speedway to the public when we have an exclusive corporate event booked," said John.

He added that corporate events should be booked as far in advance as possible and that unless people book an exclusive event, they may have to share the track with arrive-and-drive joiners.

Snacks and drinks are on sale and there's plenty of shade to relax and watch the races. Staff at the speedway also film the races for instant replays and the participants can take home DVDs of their day at the races.



All the drivers are given instructions on how to handle the karts and all have to wear crash helmets supplied by the speedway, and they are required to wear suitable footwear.

As the final races for HotelTravel.com's mini Grand Prix began, clouds came over the hills from Patong and dropped a film of water on the track – just enough to make it slippery and really put the edge on for the last races of the day.

Knowing that they now had a slippery course to negotiate, many of the drivers looked nervous, but John simply rubbed his hands with glee and proceeded to instruct the participants in how to take the corners in the wet conditions for what he knew would be an exciting and eventful final race.

The marshals frequently had their yellow flags out and clumps of earth flew through the air as overzealous drivers lost control of their karts on the turns. Bums stayed on seats though, and Blair's employees were all still in one piece at the end of the day.

The winners and runners-up received trophy cups and wall clocks fashioned from go-kart tires for their efforts, and everyone woke the next day feeling just a little sore after the speedway's punishment.




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Dining Code at Da Vinci

here is no way you are going to order French fries tonight, I said to my son. "This is an Italian restaurant." The little guy looks miffed and chooses a Proscuitto pizza (190 baht).

We're in Da Vinci, an upmarket Italian eatery deep in the heart of Nai Harn, and now that the culinary lines between dad and son have been drawn we can all relax.

Perusing the Da Vinci menu, we choose lasagna, an ensalata mista (150 baht) – and doesn't that sound so much better than a "mixed salad" – along with a white snapper filet with wine sauce and vegetables (350 baht).

Da Vinci's a looker, there's no doubt about that. With lami-

nated inside floors, a blackand-white theme, a mirror-sided bar (very handy for checking if your knees match), chandeliers and modern art on the wall, this is a far cry

from the stucco walls, Chiantibottle lamp affairs all too prevalent in Sin City.

Now open for 14 months, Da Vinci has its regulars – indeed I found out about the place through Claude Sauter, Cape Panwa's genial GM, who shall from now on be known as "Da Vinci Claude". For clement weather there's a comfortable alfresco section, which is where we chose to sit.

Max, the friendly musician, sashays through a few Brazilian songs and then goes into an extended FMaj7 to CMaj7 loop with synthesized harmonica over the top; very Stevie, very cool.

The night is breezy and fresh, the house wine (a Mezza Costa, 350 baht a carafe) flows freely and the food arrives. Before you can say "Dan Brown can type but he can't write," we're tucking into some splendid fare.

I'd had a late and rather large lunch but there is no stopping my lusty lasagna rush while Waan pronounces her fish


tamachart ("natural"). The little guy eats fully half of his pizza and insists on taking the other half home, which, by his standards, is the ultimate compliment.

Scrubbed-up Italian expats ar-

rive and Max switches to Italian songs. "That man is good," comments the little guy and he's right. He's a natural, our Max, and has a great voice to boot.

What a great combination; a talented musician who has a friendly disposition and who can

actually sing. How many Phuket musos can you name who have all of the above attributes? Okay – so he belts out *Hotel California* towards the end of the evening but nobody's perfect, are they?

This is a little slice of La Bella Italia with none of the downsides. It's smart, smells nothing like Napoli, is a no-drive zone so there are no scorched black rubber tracks across the floor. The waitresses are sexy, slim and don't have moustaches, the pizza crisp on the bottom, juicy on the top instead of the other way round and there's not a single bossy cop in sight.

Da Vinci features a decent all-Italian 20 red and white wine selection with the most expensive wines clocking in at under 2,000 baht and most hovering under the 1,000 baht mark.

We share a delectable tiramisu (all desserts 180 baht) and warble along to Max's Elton John and Christopher Cross "Saiiiiling, takes me awaaaay to where I'm alwaaays duty-free". You've got to hand it to this place; it's the Real McCoy when it comes to Italian food in a smart atmosphere at reasonable prices.

There's even parking space out back.

ore than 200 students studying at universities around the southern region Phuket-based charity the Phuket International Women's Club (PIWC) at the Satree Phuket School auditorium recently.

September 1. Tickets include cocktails, wine, dinner, and dancing to the Lai Thai Orchestra.



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Guiding light for

Doctor Supanee Tansiriroj, co-founder of Phuket International Hospital, pediatrician and mother of four, has for some 30 years been a leading presence in the development of health care in the region. Here, she shares her thoughts with *Gazette* reporter **Natcha Yuttaworawit** on the state of children's health, and the challenges faced by parents and doctors alike, on this fast-growing island.

r Supanee's long career as a doctor began in 1973 after earning her medical specialization in pediatrics in the US. She first practiced in her hometown, Bangkok, then, in the late 1970s, she and her husband Dr Anuroj Tansiriroj set up a clinic on Phang Nga Rd in Phuket Town.

In 1982, the couple opened the island's first private hospital, a 35-bed facility on Krabi Rd that planted the seed for the concept of world-class health care for Phuket.

At the same time that Dr Supanee and her husband were expanding the range of medical care to Phuket, their family was expanding, too. They had three daughters and one son, and their first child was born while Dr Supanee was studying in the US.

Undaunted by having a large family and a demanding career, Dr Supanee told the Gazette that being a pediatrician made it easier for her to raise her children, and her husband was always ready to pitch in to help. She said she was also lucky in that her children were not "stubborn".

A long-time advocate for children's health, Dr Supanee said, "Mothers have to take care of their children to be safe, happy, healthy and knowledgeable."

She said that the modern world has brought with it many unhealthy influences. "The trend of children's health is not good now because there are many convenience shops selling useless snacks and junk food, which are easy to buy for children. [Chil-

dren] do not like to exercise.

"Most importantly, parents do not have enough time to stay with their children."

Health problems including diarrhea and cholera are always a concern because children have a lower immunity from such conditions than do adults, Dr Supanee said.

Diabetes is on the rise among children, and Dr Supanee said she's seen the disease affect all ages of children from infancy up to 10 years old. The negative effects of diabetes are felt more strongly in children, too, she added.

Dengue fever has remained a threat, so Dr Supanee urged parents to take preventative measures against it. So far, no vaccine has been developed to ward off the mosquito-borne disease.

But positive trends are emerging as well, said Dr Supanee. Vaccines have virtually eliminated such diseases as diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus, and she said she has not seen a case of polio for many years.

While good medical care is important, Dr Supanee said that parents are the key factor in ensuring kids are healthy, and that their attention to health should start well before they have children.

"All husbands and wives should check their health before they get married or when they plan to have a baby," she said. After children are born, parents should ensure they provide a healthy diet and be careful about giving medicines without a doctor's prescription. She said that

breastfeeding babies for at least six months would have long-lasting effects in boosting their immunity.

Dr Supanee said children living in the countryside were more healthy than children in towns because their environment was much better. They have cleaner air, more trees and a healthier lifestyle. Children in urban areas were more likely to be exposed to potentially unhealthy public areas, such as movie theaters, placing their health at risk, she explained.

Most importantly, parents should live a healthy life as an example for their children, she said, as children tend to emulate their father and mother's behaviors.

Dr Supanee and Dr Anuroj's children certainly proved her point, since all are now health care professionals, working as doctors or management at the hospital their parents built together.

After a decade operating Siriroj Hospital on Krabi Rd, the couple built a new hospital on the bypass road, which opened in 1993 with 105 beds. In line with the growing international presence on the island, the facility was named Phuket International Hospital, though many locals still call it Siriroj.

In 2004, they undertook a major renovation, expanding the hospital to 151 beds with more than 500 staff. Many new facilities were added, including a Women's Center and Children's Center. The upgraded facility was officially opened in December last year, and work is still underway.

After a long battle with cancer, Dr Anuroj passed away on February 28 this year, leaving Dr Supanee and their family to continue to build upon his dedication to medical care.

Though she has now reduced her work hours to part time, Dr Supanee remains a strong and steady influence at the hospital she helped to build from the ground up, a life's work that can be seen in the eyes of many healthy children in Phuket and beyond.

How to become a great writer

am often asked, mostly by myself, what it takes to become a great writer. The secret is hard to put into words, but has much to do with having an excellent memory and something else, which for the moment escapes me.

It is also important to be able to express your thoughts in a clear and articulate manner, avoiding repetition and never saying the same thing twice.

The truly great writers of our time were also gifted with a rich and eclectic vocabulary. Ernest Hemingway, for example, was fond of substituting "cucumber" for "zucchini" without a care for convention, much to the wonderment and delight of readers and horticulturists everywhere.

The ability to spell was also highly prized in the days before proofreaders and electronic spellcheckers. This explains why so few of the great historical works include the word chrysanthemum in the title.

Having a muse is also considered an essential accoutrement for any great writer. A siren of breathtaking beauty and voluptuous curves is traditionally recommended to inspire and free the writer from periodic bouts of literary constipation.

However, when the power of your prose, or indeed your pocket, cannot secure the attentions of such an Aphrodite, you may have to trade down a little, which in my case means number 37 at Hot Lips A Go-Go.

Many a crippling attack of the dreaded writer's block has been dissolutely dissipated with her enchanting if somewhat crooked smile, as her hypnotic gaze penetrates the very fabric of my wallet, and she whispers "Up to you. I can everything" tenderly into my ear.

When my muse is off with her "uncle" on a fact-finding tour of pick-up truck dealerships in Isarn, I am forced to resort to

other means of overcoming my writer's block.

I will typically begin by watching the 1933 Marx Brothers movie Duck Soup, which can usually be relied on to dispel all but the most debilitating case of literary "yips", as the following example demonstrates.

Rufus T Firefly: I bet he's just using that as an excuse.

Mrs Teasdale: I was with him to the very end.

In the unlikely event that this fails to get the him: he's still got the same face. creative juices flowing, I might

swim a few laps of the bath followed by a restorative rub-down with the Literary Review.

Suitably refreshed and reinvigorated, I return to my desk to resume work on my unfinished masterpiece.

To produce writing of true genius requires tireless dedication and the willingness to push your mind to the very edge of insanity.

This is particularly true of those writing gardening columns and reviews of pantomimes and musicals.

And like all great artists, you should be prepared not to get paid until long after you are dead or up to six months after your work has been published, whichever comes last.

The reward, however, for the truly great writer, is nothing less than enduring fame and immortality.



Perhaps the hardest part of being a writer is the constant rejection from publishers and editors.

JK Rowling, the author of the now famous Harry Potter stories, was famously rejected by all 12 publishing houses to whom her agent sent the original manuscript.

However, when you look like I do, rejection is nothing new. Rather, it is the fear of having a publisher accept my work that keeps me scurrying down to Hot Lips a-Go-Go for respite from the panic.

The thought that there might be someone out there troubled enough to enjoy the tormented ramblings that flow from my pen will no doubt keep No. 37 busy for some time to come.

huket's Supercheap was the contest venue for the recent regional round of Super Chef, a TV cooking competition show. Contestants from around the region crafted coconut milk dishes for the chance to win the grand prize of 500,000 baht.

The average streetside restaurant cook would have to make nearly 200,000 green curries before reaching the half-a-millionbaht mark in trade, so the chance of earning so much money from just a few dishes brought enthusiastic chefs to the Supercheap car park to wage a coconut milk war.

The Super Chef Contest prize giveaway is a promotional effort by coconut milk brand Chao Koh (Islander) by Ampol Food Processing (APF) in celebration of the company's 20th anniver-

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uckland is a modern bustling city, yet it has a tremendous oldworld – almost 18thcentury feel to it. Down at Viaduct Quay, old meets new with a Maritime Museum alongside recent America's Cup contenders, including *Spirit of New Zealand*, the controversial 1988 entry.

Just off the east coast of Auckland is Waiheke Island, a beautiful, unspoiled rural area that is home to Kennedy Point Wines.

Kennedy Point produces an excellent Cabernet Sauvignon and a superb Syrah. The vineyard is planted on steep, north-facing slopes. As well as wine, Kennedy Point produces fine extra virgin olive oil and avocado oil – all available for tasting.

Goldwater Estate is one of the better known wineries on Waiheke, producing a Merlot as well as its flagship wine, a blend of Cabernet, Merlot and Franc.

Goldwater was established in 1978 by Kim and Jeanette Goldwater when they planted their first vinifera vineyard on Waiheke. There are more than 30 vineyards on Waiheke, but Goldwater is one of the most successful, exporting wine to 25 countries.

Stonyridge Vineyard on Waiheke produces some of the finest wines under the Stonyridge Larose label; the winery also bottles a range called Fallen Angel wines, but does not actually produce the grapes on the 25hectare estate.

Stonyridge's flagship wines are a classic Chardonnay and a tasty Merlot Cabernet Franc. The latter is a deep-colored red wine with rich aromas of ripe Waiheke fruit, cassis and plums. The leathery flavors of Merlot combine to add further interest.

ON SOUTH

Head south out of Auckland on Highway 1 towards Rotarua. Not an inspiring drive, but the traffic is light.

For passionate motor racing fans – any old enough to remember the mid-'60s Tasman series – you must stop off at Pukehohe raceway, 45km south of Auckland, just off Highway 1.

Blessed island of wine



ivew Zealand s unique climate and geography, along with the innovative falir of its winemakers, such as TimTurvey (right), have helped the nation's wines earn international accolades and premium prices.

The Tasman series was eight races – four in Australia, four New Zealand – that got the drivers such as Jimmy Clark, Bruce McLaren and Jackie Stewart away from winter in Europe. Pukekohe was one of these tracks.

When the three-lane section of Highway 1

ends, you are on country roads where traffic is light. Before you reach the township of Cambridge, be sure to stop off at the Red Cherry licented café the best coffee in Australia Ly

censed café – the best coffee in New Zealand.

Turn onto Highway 5 towards Rotorua, built on a volcanic crater, and on to Taupo, in the center of the North Island

Lake Taupo is yet another volcanic crater, similar to Rotorua, but less of a tourist-magnet. Taupo is very pleasant for an overnight stop before heading up into the mountains towards Napier and Hawkes Bay.

HAWKES BAY

Some of best red wines come from Hawkes Bay. Clearview Estate Winery in Te Awanga, close to the delightfully named Cape Kidnappers, is run by Tim Turvey, a self-taught winemaker who produces some exquisite wines from his

estate. "I have been a grower of

just about everything throughout my life," he says. "I had the biggest pineapple farm in

Australia. I was growing everything – peas, beans, peaches – all in Hawkes Bay.

"Someone offered me a job in the wine industry, but I said I know nothing about grapes. He said, "You know everything about every other kind of plant!" They said they'd make it worth my while, and they did, and that's when I fell in love with grapes.

"I bought this place – then around 75 acres – 23 years ago and established a vineyard. And when the first fruit came on I realized I'd got something a little special, so I decided to make my own wine."

New Zealand's unique geography and climate, coupled with the creativity of its innovative winemakers, has enabled New Zealand wine to attain international recognition and to command the highest average price per bottle of wine in the world.

Michael Daymond-King owns Hatton Estate, an exclusive winery that supplies some of celebrated chef Gordon Ramsey's restaurants, as well as those of Jimmy Chin in New York.

"There are two reasons why there is such unprecedented demand for New Zealand wine on a global basis. The first is that the wines are very easy to understand. They have a very good fruit definition, which is what people like and they know they go very, very well with food. Plus, I think, New Zealand people love showing off about their place and talking about the country. And I think they do that very well.

"You only have to look at the figures in the UK. I think New Zealand is 0.4% of the world's wine production, but it is fully 6% of the on-trade market in London. Lamb does not have that penetration, but wine does.

"The advantages we have are that from the top of the North Island it is like being in Spain, while at the bottom of the South Island, it's like Scotland. When you think about that kind of scale, over a 1,500-kilometer distance, you have a huge amount of different climates," he adds.


"Here in Hawkes Bay you've got a dry climate during the summer, so we produce wines very like a Bordeaux. When you talk about the whites in the central part of New Zealand, they are much more Burgundian in style, although much more fruit defined."

Church Road Winery is located almost in the center of Napier, a strange place to discover a winery. Over the years the estate has been sold off for housing and most of the vines are a little further out nearer the coast.

Church Road owns about 2,500 acres of vines, but also has 44 contractors supplying grapes for bottling. A spokeswoman for Church Road says they keep a close eye on the quality of the grapes from their subcontractors, but adds that the quality of all its grapes is "checked by hand".

The one-acre site actually at Church Road is solely for Merlot grapes, "the top end of the market," she says.

That New Zealand wine is becoming much sought after should come as no surprise to anyone that has visited the archipelago and experienced some of the very best on offer. They are relatively expensive compared with, say, Australian or South American wines, but they really do have a character all their own.

PATONG: Over the past six weeks, global franchise giants Starbucks and McDonald's opened on Soi Bangla, with both promoting their social responsibility programs as key strategies.


The Seattle-based drip-coffee giant Starbucks opened its seventh branch on Phuket with the opening of Starbucks Twilight on Soi Bangla on August 14. Store manager Kraiwut "Dom" Sae-Auy explained that the Bangla branch opens at 10 am and closes at 3 am and that the prices charged are the same for all Starbucks nationwide.

Starbucks' Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) project, which has guaranteed customers that the beans used in their brews are grown organically and harvested by farmers who are not exploited, has gone a step further in Soi Bangla where the baristas have taken to heart the corporate slogan "Make your Passion to Improve the World come to life through Starbucks" – every Wednesday they clean up litter strewn along Patong Beach.

In Thailand, Starbucks is expanding, while in other countries it is closing branches. In Australia this year, 61 of its 84 stores were closed.

According to company founder Howard Schultz's book *Pour Your Heart Into It: How Starbucks Built a Company One Cup at a Time*, the name of the company was derived from a character in *Moby-Dick*.

Starbucks' logo of a barebreasted, twin-tailed siren – a Greek mythological character – now has hair covering her nipples and navel, although some of the paper cups feature the older logo

that reveals slightly more.

Although there are a few chairs outside for customers, there are also "No smoking" signs. Speaking to the customers, it became obvious why this branch seems to be so popular – most families and couples who stroll the streets looking for souvenirs would rather sit on a luxurious sofa in an air-conditioned environment than take their loved ones into a noisy girlie bar.

Families seem to enjoy the cafe and apart from being a place to rest their legs after shopping or somewhere to escape the rain, it is probably due to the large amount of non-coffee options available that start with Starbucks' own-brand products, such as Tazo teas and various frappuccino offerings.

With the 3 am closing time, it is no longer necessary to invite a girl home for coffee; you can have it right there on Soi Bangla

McSAWASDEE

Starbucks Twilight opened right next door to Patong's third McDonald's, which opened on July 23. Like the other two McD's in Patong, it is open 24 hours a day and serves tortilla breakfasts with Canadian bacon from 5 am to 11 am at 59 baht, or including gourmet coffee for 80 baht.

McDonald's southern re-

gion consultant Sayan Sungkasem told the *Gazette* that the prices at McDonald's on Soi Bangla are higher than elsewhere, not because tourists should be charged more, but because the overheads of running a business in Patong are higher than elsewhere.

Another difference is that while most McDonald's branches now have a McCafé section, this one has a Dessert Kiosk instead in the sheltered outdoor area.

Tourists strolling down Bangla smile when they see the attention to cross-cultural detail, a large statue of Ronald Mc-Donald greeting them with a tra-



ditional Thai *wai*. Even the *katoey* that pose for pictures with tourists have started noticing that Ronald is one of the most popular characters on the street to have a picture taken with.

Japanese tourists love taking pictures with Ronald and also appreciate the Samurai pork burger.

Catering to those with midnight munchies is a late-night special between midnight and 5 am: customers who spend 120 baht or more get a free spinach pie so that they can feel like Popeye for the rest of the night.

The new outlet also offers McDelivery service (Tel: 1711) that delivers orders for a 20-baht surcharge (30 baht for orders placed between midnight and 9 am).

The decor reflects Mc-Donald's policy "directly improving the health and well-being of children", with colorful pictures of young children on the walls to promote the Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC).

RMHC raises money for its three core programs: Ronald McDonald's Family Rooms, Care Mobile units, and Ronald Mc-Donald Houses, each of which the charity calls "The House that Love Built". All three projects focus on providing care and support for children with special medical needs.

or more than a year the incumbent UK government effectively tried to look on "the bright side" of the current economic situation. The change of direction when it came was 180 degrees. The British Chancellor of the

Exchequer (Minister of Finance), Alastair Darling, in an interview with the Guardian newspaper, revealed the true viewpoint at present.

The UK economy is facing its worst situation in 60 years and is set for an abrupt and painful slowdown. Something along the lines of "you ain't seen nothing yet".

For businesses coming back from holidays to face a grim economic slowdown, this is still credit crunch territory and the financial sector is going to want to keep itself as liquid as its balance sheets allow, at least until early 2009.


This is not unusual. Banks generally like to have good liquidity levels to assist over the Christmas-New Year season, which is a time of important annual economic activity. Credit is not going to be easily available. There are sections within the UK economy who view a mortgage as some sort of piggy bank.

In recent years, money was withdrawn from mortgages for everything from a new kitchen, to a luxury overseas holiday or various consumer durables. As a result, more UK citizens are now living with a higher debt burden than their US counterparts, when adjusted income levels are taken into account.

When people are heavily indebted and credit availability suddenly evaporates, there must be consequences. There is also a need to recognize that there are vast differences between the US and UK economies. For example, the housing market: for a home owner who is taking a long view and has no intention of selling, house price falls are almost irrelevant.

One of the differences in the UK economy compared with the US is that the former is small geographically and has a substantial population in relation to its size. Analysts, economists and real estate groups all insist that there is an undersupply of housing in the UK. In addition, the

amount of housing being built in the good years was not keeping up with demand.

Now, we have a banking sector that has totally changed its views on lending, and is not very enthusiastic about the process. Borrowers now have to be able to display high deposits, verifiable incomes and the ability to pay off a mortgage without any major financial stress.

This is going to cut the numbers of transactions in the market and the latest statistics show that average UK house prices have fallen more than 10% in the last year. There is muttering in the market that house prices could fall 30% from peak to trough.

The government is definitely

going to stimulate the market to a degree; whether this will really contribute remains to be seen.

Alastair Darling's speech achieved something else. It removed any doubt about the direction of the currency. The markets took him at his word and enthusiastically increased the speed at which the pound sterling was falling in value.

The pound, at the time of writing, has fallen more than 15% against the US dollar this year. It has fallen though multiple resistance levels with great ease. In reality, the pound was never worth US\$2; a level of US\$1.50 is far more realistic; it seems to be heading in that direction.

he car that put the world on wheels, the Model T Ford, celebrates its 100th anniversary this year. Launched in October 1908, with a 2,896cc engine delivering a heady 20hp, the "T" was significant in that it featured a monobloc motor casting and a detachable cylinder head.

Transmission was a twospeed epicyclic system that had been used on previous Fords. Top speed was around 45 miles per hour, or 72 kmh.

Fuel consumption was in the region of 13-21 miles per (American) gallon, or around five to nine kilometers per liter, running on gasoline or ethanol, although the introduction of prohibition ultimately made the latter impractical as an alternative fuel. Fuel was gravity-fed to the carburetor and for this reason steep gradients had to be tackled in reverse if fuel levels were low.

When Henry Ford died in 1947, a Detroit newspaper published the headline "The Father of the Automobile Dies". Such was Henry's influence on modern transport and the mobility of the aspiring American public. The Model T was designed, though, by Childe Harold Wills and two Hungarian immigrants by the name of Joseph A. Galamb and Eugene Farkas.

The first Model Ts were made in a factory on Piquette Avenue in Detroit, but in April 1910 Henry Ford moved production to a new facility at Highland Park. Although Ford already produced more vehicles than any of its competitors at the time, Henry instigated the moving production line in 1913, further increasing the numbers turned out.

In 1914, the first full year of production, Ford built 308,162 cars. Two years on and that figure had more than doubled. By the end of its production life in May, 1927, more than 15 million Model Ts had been sold.

In December 1999, it was named, rightly, "Car of the Century" by a panel of 133 automotive journalists and industry experts who began with a list of 700 candidates in 1996 and sequentially whittled down the nominees through seven rounds of ballot-



ing over the ensuing three years.

In 1909, a standard fourseat open tourer cost \$850; by 1915 this had dropped to just \$440, thanks to improved production methods. Although Henry Ford is widely credited with introducing the production line to auto making, it was in fact William C. Klann who brought it to Ford after seeing Chicago's Union Stock Yards where cattle were butchered as they moved along a moving belt. When the first car was completed on the new assembly line, it was Klann who proudly drove it off the end of the line.

Although the Model T was listed as a "three-speed" vehicle, in actual fact it was just two; the other gear was reverse. The transmission was controlled by three foot pedals and the throttle by a lever on the steering wheel.

The original wheels were wooden artillery wheels, although towards the end of production steel spokes were introduced. Pneumatic tires were fitted, with an optional size available for the more demanding roads in the south of the US.

By 1919, almost all cars sold had electric starters; before that they had to be started by a hand crank and, often, when the engine kicked back, a driver's thumb would be broken.

Although Henry is reputed to have said, "A customer can have any color he likes so long as it's black", in fact the Model T was available in a variety of colors. Indeed, the earliest cars were not even available in black. Documents in Ford archives suggest that black was widely adopted for a number of components because it was cheap and durable.

Speed of assembly was clearly essential to making the car inexpensive and by 1914 it took just 93 minutes to assemble a Model T.

That year, Ford produced

more cars than all other automakers combined.

Celebrations have been taking place in the United States, notably at a gathering of Model T owners held in Richmond, Indiana in July, where more than 1,000 cars turned up.

Model T Fast Facts

• The idea that the Model T only came in black probably comes from the fact that almost 12 million of the 15 million produced were, in fact, black. But Henry Ford never actually said it, unless joking perhaps...

• Before the Model T, cars were built with their steering wheels on the right, the left or in the center. The Model T standardized the

immy Breslin is a living legend, the *membering Me* (Little, Brown & Co, New last of his kind: the hard-drinking, foot-slogging, champion-of-thepeople newspaper columnist. Today, the closest thing to a plausible organized effort in North America comes from the American Literacy Council, which is promoting a version of English that looks like this: "Hav u ever considerd th meny benefits ov a simplified fonetic speling that soundz just like it's riten?"

Come to think of it, that looks an awful lot like text-message English, as in: "RU redy 4 ths?" instead of "Are you ready for this?" and so forth. Mike, are you sure you're in favor of simplified spelling? The text-message set may inflict it on us, regardless.

I suspect that you, along with many brilliant minds in the English-teaching world, would hate it.

You'd expect someone whose business card reads "Communications Faculty, Jones Graduate School of Management, Rice University" to know the answer to my question.

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Leave those hills alone

The Gazette offers its belated congratulations to Pian Keesin on his recent re-election as Mayor of Patong, but disagrees strongly with several items in the seven-point platform he promised to pursue following his victory.

Foremost among them is his pledge to continue efforts to push for a change in the ban on the construction of permanent structures above 80 meters.

Sensibly established in 1994 to stop erosion, landslides and flooding - while maintaining what is left of the island's hillside scenery the statute is probably the best environmental protection measure put in place specifically for Phuket, even if enforcement of it has been very poor.

Many of the worst violations have been in Patong, where in October last year a landslide that undermined the foundations of a holiday home and apartment block off Nanai Rd caused an emergency evacuation. Last April, an illegal logging camp was raided high in the hills near Tri Trang Beach.

In November 2005, a landslide crashed through the wall of a dwelling on Nanai Rd, killing a Thai woman and her child.

In July this year, three Burmese laborers were crushed to death by a landslide at the site of a new apartment block being built on 50 Pi Rd following heavy rains.

While many of these tragedies happened at projects under the 80-meter limit, the forces of gravity and other laws of physics do not discriminate as to whether dangerous construction work is taking place above or below that altitude.

In the end, all that extending the limit will achieve would be to expand the area over which such calamities can take place, worsen already severe flooding conditions [see News pages] and add to the number of residences adding sewage to the municipality's abysmally inadequate water-treatment capabilities.

Rather than working to push to extend the 80-meter limit higher, Patong Municipality should be placing its efforts on stricter enforcement of the existing statute, doing a better job of reviewing construction permit applications, and keeping a closer watch over projects to ensure all the required drainage and erosion-control equipment and procedures are in place and working properly - especially at the onset of the rainy season.

Another easy-to-implement solution that could be introduced in Patong and other areas would be to send out survey teams to clearly delineate where the 80-meter boundary lies. Such work could be conducted at minimal cost by engineering students from local universities as part of their training. The Editor

I own a travel agency in Phuket that caters to Korean tourists. After the airport was closed, I had four honeymoon couples who could not go home to Korea, and this week four couples have already canceled coming to Phuket - and this is only with my business

In total, more than 1,000 Korean tourists canceled coming to Phuket in a single week.

The "honeymoon season" in Korea starts about September 27, but now, about 20% of my honeymoon bookings have already canceled.

During this season, roughly more than 6,000 Koreans arrive in Phuket each week.

If the airport is closed again, it will seriously damage our tourism industry.

Now Korean Air and Asiana Airlines, as well as travel agencies in Korea, such as Hana Tour, Mode tour, Lotte and others, are discussing whether or not to stop sending tourists here.

Phuket's economy depends on tourists. No tourists means no money – it is plain common sense. JS Holiday Phuket

Show us the money!

Front page headlines are shouting revenue losses of B250m a day, with total losses estimated at 50 to 60 billion baht, or up to 10% of the 700 billion baht targeted tourism revenue for the year.

With these kind of figures being bandied about, it really makes you wonder why Phuket has been starved of such funds to maintain its infrastructure and incinerators. Could this be an explanation as to why there was such a political reaction locally?

riends of mine often ask me what I do with my spare time now that I am retired. As a matter of fact, I don't have much spare time. Rather than just spend time with my family and friends, I am preoccupied with my consulting business and the two daily 40-kilometer drives taking my daughter to school in Phuket City and back.

Dirty water disposal

Where in Phuket can a ship owner properly dispose of oily bilge water? Example: I have a client that called me and wanted to know where he could dispose of about 700 liters of water that was mistakenly put into his diesel fuel tank when the fuel tank contained only a few liters of diesel fuel.

We are concerned that if a contractor is hired to pump it out, they will go to an isolated location and just dump it.

So is there any place someone can properly dispose of oily or fuel-contaminated water on Phuket? Or are there any companies that have an oil/water separator that can accept this for a fee?

Prachum Suriya, Head of Environmental section of Phuket **Municipality Office, replies:**

We have a bio-diesel oil disposal machine at our incinerator area that can be used for this purpose. We heat used diesel oil or fuel-contaminated water to 60 degrees Celsius to make the water evaporate, leaving the oil, which can be used as fuel for the incinerator.

Some Thai banks have announced much better interest rates on fixed-term deposits for terms from three to 36 months.

If I deposit 200,000 baht in my regular savings account for day-to-day needs and another 600,000 baht in a fixed-term account, can I present proof to Immigration of having more than 800,000 baht comprising the total funds in the two accounts?

The rules are as flexible and friendly as possible. You can produce any number of different bankbooks to show that you have funds totaling 800,000 baht or more.

The accounts can be either regular deposit or fixed-term deposit accounts. Current accounts and bonds of any description, however, cannot be used for the application.

The only other restrictions is that the money must have already been deposited in a bank for at least 90 days before the date of applying for the permitto-stav.

Shipping in a dog from overseas

I am shipping my dog to Phuket from the US. I know I need to notify the health department a certain amount of time before she arrives.

Where do I go? I have already taken care of transport and health inspection papers in the States.

I just need to know what, where, when and how I need to do what is needed in Phuket.

John Dalley of the Soi Dog Foundation replies:

Regardless of whether you are bringing your dog with you from the States or whether you are already here and importing it, in either case, you need to comply with the following:

1. Your dog must have a current rabies vaccination and certificate. Vaccination must be done at least 15 days before export but no more than 12 months before export.

2. Your dog must be vaccinated against leptospirosis at least 21 days before export.

3. For Phuket, your dog must be micro-chipped. The microchip number should be included on the veterinary certificate and vaccination book.

4. Hold a valid certificate

signed by an authorized veterinarian that refers to the microchip number and vaccination book.

5. Dogs should be at least four months old before having a rabies vaccination.

If your dog is traveling with you, you can apply for an import permit on arrival, but convenience depends on the time you arrive.

If you arrive at night, you will have to wait until the veterinarian is on duty the next day.

It will, of course, be smoother to prepare this document beforehand.

The veterinary office is situated upstairs at the airport cargo terminal of Phuket International Airport.

Please note that fighting dogs such as American Pit bulls and American Staffordshires will not be allowed into Thailand.

I advise that you inform your airline in advance that you will be taking your dog so it can be put in the air-conditioned section of the cargo hold.

This is much cheaper than taking your dog as accompanied baggage, though some people prefer to pay extra to do this as the dog is checked in with you and arrives on the carousel.

If the dog travels as cargo, you have to collect it from the cargo terminal when it arrives.



friend of mine brought me her computer the other day and showed me a giant warning like the one pictured on this page. She knew that she needed Antivirus XP 2008, but she didn't know how to install it. Thank heaven.

Another friend brought me a computer that always booted to a Blue Screen of Death that said Error 0x00000050 PAGE FAULT_IN_NON_PAGED_ AREA. It took a whole day to unwind all of the junkware on that computer, but when I got down to the bottom dreck, I found Antivirus XP 2008.

I've received messages from at least six people in Phuket who want to know about this fabulous new program, Antivirus XP 2008 (or XP Antivirus 2009 or similar).

Here's what you need to know: it's malware, plain and simple, and if you install it you're handing your computer over to some very sophisticated folks who will install key loggers (to watch over your shoulder as you type in your bank account information), bot software (to turn your computer into a zombie, spewing out zillions of spam messages), various kinds of spyware,

Distributed Denial of Service software (you, too, could be part of the Russian cvberterrorism

effort against Georgia), and the scummiest, dirtiest stuff you've ever seen on any PC.

Here's the crazy part. Most people install Antivirus XP 2008 voluntarily.

Usually, intended victims receive a spam message that invites their prey to install this wonderful new program. You figure, hey, it couldn't be any worse than the big-name antivirus program you have now – the one that's no doubt bugging you every two days to cough up your credit card number to stay up to date - and figure it's worth a try.

Wrong.

Some people pick up Antivirus XP 2008 by clicking on a link on a decent, well-known website. They just don't realize that people who run big websites frequently farm out their advertising, and sometimes the ads (which are delivered independently of the page itself) harbor threatening stuff.

A year ago, web job-placement site Monster.com started showing one ad that was used to harvest financial data from at least 46,000 people (tinyurl.com/ 67q54h).

ain't 'anti'

site reports (tinyurl.com/55pjnk) that, not long ago, Google was showing "sponsored" paid links that pointed directly to the Antivirus XP 2008 site. If you use Google to search for "CNN Top 10 Antivirus", one of the display ads came up with "Free Antivirus XP 2008 / Free, safe, accurate online scan. Free online check. 2008antivirusxp.com." Predictably, the link took you directly to one of many Antivirus XP 2008 download sites. At least for a little while: when I checked the link two days later, it had been suspended by the Russian hosting site.

The exact method of infection can vary, as will the payloads. Antivirus XP 2008 has been modified slightly to become Windows Antivirus 2008, Vista Antivirus 2008, XPAntiVirus and


many others. It's KHUN WOODY'S even been grafted onto a downloadable COMPUTER video codec (decoder). They all

warn you with breathless prose about the nasty denizens of your computer, and urge you to install Antivirus XP 2008 to protect and defend.

Computer Associates calls the entire Antivirus XP 2008 family "one part trojan, one part downloader, and one part rogue security product". But it isn't a virus. It doesn't replicate itself. Instead, it uses very good marketing - called "social engineering" in some circles - to convince you to install it.

If you want to watch a system get infected with XP Anti-

from the scumware, there's a fascinating and scary video on Youtube at tinyurl.com/68jwu2. If you've got it, how do you

remove it? For starters, don't even bother with Windows Add or Remove Programs. Any company clever enough to call a piece of scum "XP Antivirus" isn't going to make it easy for you to get rid of it.

I've had the most luck scouring XP Antivirus 2008 from systems by running an AVG Free full-system scan and, for good measure, following that with a complete run of Windows Defender. Here's the shorthand version of how to do both:

Go to tinyurl.com/6j4wx4. That takes you to the AVG Free version 8 site on Download.com.

www.djpit-travel.com

About halfway down the page, on the right, click the green button that says Download Now. After you've downloaded the file, run it. Go through the installation wizard, and choose custom installation. That way you can choose to install the whole program, or only keep the core parts. When you're asked if you want to install the AVG Security Toolbar, uncheck the box and click Next. Take the rest of the defaults.

AVG Free comes up and asks you to pick a time of day for running automatic scans - I generally run them early in the morning, but I don't turn off my computer. Uncheck the box that invites you to allow AVG to collect information about your usage.

When you're asked about checking for updates, be sure you

do – might as well start with the most recent virus file definitions available. On the next screen, there's no reason to register. Click Next, then Finish, and you're ready to run your first scan.

Double-click the AVG icon in the system tray, next to the clock in the bottom-right corner of the screen. AVG's main menu appears. Click the Tools option, then choose Advanced Settings. On the left, click LinkScanner. Uncheck the box that says "Enable AVG Search-Shield" then click OK. That snubs another privacy-robbing feature of AVG Free 8.

Microsoft's Windows Defender is absolutely free, but you have to be able to pass the "Windows Genuine Advantage" test. If you have a legitimate copy of Windows XP, go to tinyurl.com/ 5q36co and follow the instructions to download, install and run Windows Defender.

If your copy of Windows is of, uh, uncertain pedigree, a good free alternative is Spybot S&D, tinyurl.com/2c4c69. Either of the programs should provide a fair amount of protection against XP Antivirus 2008 and its ilk.





When Antivirus

B oxing is in bad shape and in desperate need of repair. Boxing fans are occasionally presented with fights truly worth watching, but more often than not promoters and matchmakers trick the public into thinking they are getting more for their money than they really are.

The gig is up, though. Fans in the US are no longer as apt to shell out \$50 for a pay-per-view card; they have done so too many times before – all for the privilege of watching cards that in the past would not even have made it to free TV.

Slowly but surely, the sport is sliding into obscurity, bled dry of everything it has to offer. Gone are the days when every man, woman and child knew the name of boxing champions. The average boxing fan has lost touch and it will take another Sugar Ray Leonard or a young Mike Tyson to steer the sport back in the right direction.

Fifty years ago, there were boxing gyms in almost every neighborhood. Boxing was a staple on television; local shows took place every week and fans knew who fighters were. They knew their names, their faces and they learned about their lives.

These pugilists were the predecessors to today's reality TV stars – they were the real deal and it was all on TV for fans to see. There was Rocky Graziano, the juvenile delinquent

who turned his life around through boxing and fought three life-ordeath battles with the Man of Steel, Tony Zale; there was Sugar Ray Robinson and his pink Cadillac, and of course, Rocky "The Brockton Blockbuster" Marciano, the only heavyweight champion ever to retire undefeated. All these great fighters were household names.

This all changed with the

advent of HBO and satellite TV in 1975, when, for a fee of course, millions around the world were able to see the third bout between Muhammad Ali and Joe Frazier, commonly referred to as "The Thrilla in Manila". Boxing has never been the same.

HBO Sports President Ross Greenburg called the expansion of pay-per-view "the biggest economic issue in boxing".

"I can't tell you that payper-view helps the sport because it doesn't. It hurts the sport because it narrows the audience, but it's a fact of life," he said.

it's a fact of life," he said. The WBA, WBC, IBF and WBO are currently the four major sanctioning bodies of boxing. The proliferation of these organizations and their sub-affiliates has watered down the sport, making it difficult for the casual fan to keep up with who's who.

Each sanctioning body has 17 weight divisions, ranging from strawweight (105 lbs) to heavyweight, accounting for a bare minimum of 68 champions.

Include "interim champions", "champions in recess" and the WBA's "super champions", and you get somewhere in the neighborhood of 80 champions. The average sports writer now needs a cheat sheet to help him remember them all. The average

boxing fan has lost touch with the sport's champions, much in the same way that the mu-

sic world has lost its "greatest hits" role in popular culture with such a vast selection of ways to get music – rather than just radio.

In the past, there were eight traditional divisions; flyweight (112 lbs), bantamweight (118 lbs), featherweight (126 lbs), lightweight (135 lbs), welterweight (147 lbs), middleweight (160 lbs), light heavyweight (175 lbs), and heavyweight (unlimited). There were eight champions, not 80.

As the sanctioning bodies became more influential, the number if weight divisions increased. This was ostensibly for safety reasons, but boxing is also big business and millions of dollars are at stake. Each time a title fight takes place, the alphabet-soup organizations charge a sanctioning fee, normally between 1% and 3%.

It makes good business sense, at least in the short run, to increase the number of championship fights worldwide. The more championships, the greater the revenue for the sanctioning bodies.

In Thailand, boxing has reached an all-time, immeasurable low. Currently, the country is home to two world champions, WBC minimumweight titleholder Oleydong Sithsamerchai and

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WBC women's flyweight champion Samson Sor Siriporn.

Sithsamerchai is a legitimate champion, having defeated one of the divisions' best, Eagle Kyowa, to win the world title. Sor Siriporn won her world title while serving time in the Women's Correctional Institute for Drug Offenders and her bout against Japanese fighter Ayaka Miyano for the vacant title is widely regarded as a publicity stunt outside of Thailand. In the near future, she'll be forced to face her mandatory challenger. Chances are her title reign will end once she does.

In yet another example of the mismatches that are bleeding the sport dry, former WBC flyweight champion Chatchai Sasakul of Thailand recently challenged for the WBC super flyweight title held by one of boxing's pound-for-pound best fighters, Christian Mijiares of Mexico.

A few years ago, Sasakul had requested a bout with world champion Masamori Tokuyama. "I'll fight anyone, winning or losing isn't so important," said Sasakul. "I want one more big payday," he continued. "It's getting harder and harder for me to keep up with these young guys and my time is running out."

Tokuyama retired while still in his prime, before a bout with Sasakul could be made.

In the past 10 years, Sasakul has fought nothing but unranked, unknown fighters. Somehow, he won a regional title, then climbed to number four in the WBC world ratings. Last year, after knocking out Lito Sisnorio in four rounds, the Filipino fighter died from injuries sustained during the bout, and Sasakul has looked like an unwilling participant in his subsequent bouts.

His fragile state in the ring, along with his advanced age and lack of decent opposition, made him easy prey for Mijiares. At one time, Sasakul was an excellent champion but at 38 years of age, Sasakul is now well past his prime and the bout with Mijiares was a foregone conclusion. The champion toyed with Sasakul for two rounds before dispatching of him in the third round.

Mismatches, ridiculous ratings, over-priced pay-per-view events and far too many unworthy fighters crowned as champions have seriously damaged the sport of boxing. This is boxing as goes the saying – it's a sport well known for its carnival ways and wide range of characters. Maybe that's what keeps us coming back.

Kata crew dominate Phuket Surf Contest

KARON: Despite the southwesterly monsoon winds bringing the usual heavy rains this time of year, they failed to provide the usual good surf for the annual Phuket Surf Contest held at Kata Beach from September 5 to 7.

However, that didn't stop Noppasit "Ko" Boochuai from Kata making the most of the junior surf. He was awarded Best Wave of the competition and won the long board division.

Indeed, local Kata surfers dominated the event, winning three of the four divisions and many more ranking high in the final standings.

Aek, also from Kata, finished second in the long board division, followed by Chalee (Kata), Chalong (Patong) and Dam (Patong). In true local fashion, only first names or nicknames of entrants were recorded by organizers.

Ko also surfed well in the short board division, finishing in second place, an accolade in itself as the shorter boards are faster than their longer counterparts, making it more difficult for surfers to keep pace with the slower, smaller waves and score points.

Fellow Kata surfer Jimmy won the short board division, with Lim from Kamala in third place, followed by Chalong (Patong) and Lukmud (Kata).

Oliver from Kamala won the grommet (young surfer) division, followed by Panu from Kata, John (Kata), Palangkeab (Karon) and Beach (Kata).

"This year, the weather was not so good. Waves were only about one meter high and there were strong winds and it rained," he added.

Construction **Rawai gets** a 'touch of platinum'

RAWAI: Construction on seven electric cables, the developers of the luxury pool villas in the 21-unit Platinum Residence Park project are now complete, with the remaining homes expected to be ready by the end of next year.

The project, on 11 rai on Wiset Rd, about 500 meters from Wat Sawang-arom, is being developed by Platinum Residence Co Ltd.

Tim Sozanski, Platinum Residence Park Director of Sales, told the *Gazette* that the construction of the project started at the beginning of last year. About 40% of villas, which are custom-built to buyers' orders, have been sold. Some owners have already moved into their villas.

Both Europeans and Thais have shown interest in the project, Mr Sozanski said.

Platinum Residence Park project features high-end villas designed in a combination of Western and Balinese style.

There are three different types of one and two-story villas, set on land plots averaging about 700 square meters in area.

The project features wide roads, spacious walkways, a "green zone" and underground say.

The "A" type two-story, three-bedroom pool villa, called "Koh I Noor", is designed with a living space of 482 square meters.

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
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

he lobby of any resort is always the centerpiece of an hotel – a walkthrough art exhibit that introduces people to the hotel's theme. It should be spacious, relaxing and inspiring at the same time, giving guests something to talk and wonder about while they wait for their room key.

At Mai Khao, the JW Marriott Phuket Resort & Spa's lobby was recently renovated by Bensley Design Studio to encapsulate the resort's special brand of Thai hospitality under spectacular architecture that reflects Phuket's colonial past.

Of course, anything created by the Bensly studio is guaranteed to be eye catching for its boldness and thought provoking for its profound connotations. The theme of the Marriott lobby's revamp was brought to life by architect Jirachai Rengthongthey, who has done an excellent job of maintaining the Bensley Studio's reputation for designing contemporary creations that will one day become classic designs and be used in textbooks to teach aspiring architecture and design students.

In keeping with Phuket's colonial-like past, the Marriott's lobby is a contemporary reflection of the Sino-Portuguese style of the historical town. The result is a high-ceilinged airy lobby that is an elegant blend of clean, solid lines subtly disrupted with brickwork that is brushed with a calming turquoise tinge and resembling the walls of ancient temple ruins.

Set along the wall behind the reception desk is a relief of sculptured copper tinged with green that runs the length of the wall behind the reception desk.

"The renovation focused mostly on changing the reception counter in the lobby, which used to have a classic French look referred to by designers as 'luxury Louis style'. The furniture was

changed form the classic French look to more rustic-looking items that give a more laid back feel. The relief behind the reception counter is meant to look old and resemble a shipwreck to fit in with the beach life environment of the resort," said Mr Jirachai.

Adding to the lobby's tran-

quility is a U-shaped pond that guests can sit around. "When guests sit in the lobby they face a large reflection pond. This was added to induce calmness and as a refreshing visual attraction to help relieve the stress of their journey on the way to the resort," he added. Mr Jirachai explained how the lobby's new design attempts to be more vivid than the darker decor used before, which reflected elements from Southern Thailand's traditional shadow puppet displays *nang dalung*.

"The previous design used a lot of dark brown. It was just too dark, so we changed it to be much brighter and to be composed of various small antique pieces instead.

The new wall relief was made from a mold containing boat construction tools and materials arranged together with small pieces of wood and copper bought from antique shops," he said.


"The surface of the reception counter continues with the 'shipwreck' theme. All the furnishing are made of copper and have been given a lusty green tinge to enhance the feeling of a beach-side resort, which is a definite contrast to the luxury Louis style," Mr Jirachai added.

The reflection pond is one of the most distinctive additions to the lobby's decor, explained Mr Jirachai.

"The pond matches the sea view. When hotel guests walk through the lobby they will feel as if they are already at the sea and it turns into a beautiful reflection of the evening sunsets. We scattered furniture around the pool, some of the items are old pieces of furniture that have been restored and we've added some modern pieces, as well."

"To reflect the contemporary Sino-Portuguese theme in the structure, redwood was used for the beams and the lobby is designed to let the sea breeze flow through, keeping the place cool and allowing guests to feel comfortable and relaxed," said Mr Jirachai.

"White has been used a lot in the lobby revamp, this was especially important to lighten up the lobby where the ceiling becomes low near the reception counter," he added.

Koh Samui in full bloom

ver the years, Koh Samui has made a stunning market shift from backpackers' paradise in the 1970s and '80s to its present push as one of the region's premier island destinations.

From the onset of significant tourism, most development was focused on the eastern area at Chaweng Beach, with access limited to ferry service from the mainland.

Most visitors either flew to Surat Thani or came by bus or train before crossing by sea. Mass tourism entered the picture with the privately developed and operated airport opened by Bangkok Airways in 1989.

During the past decade, development by both Thai and international investors has accelerated, which has seen a laidback island fishing village metamorphose into a mid-market tourism destination, and it is now shifting gears and entering the branded world of high-end luxury.

Direct international air links to Hong Kong and Singapore supported the building boom and



a key growth component has been the opening of the airport to Thai Airways and a handful of overseas carriers.

Historically, the number of tourist arrivals on Samui has not been as dazzling as that of Phuket due to Bangkok Airways'

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monopoly over air services to the island. Over 10 years, starting from 1998, guest arrivals at tourism establishments grew at an average of only 1.5% per annum; capping off at 854,475 in 2007.

However, the total visitor arrivals at Samui Airport from 1995 to 2007 grew at an average compounded rate of 9% - and from 2003 to 2007 grew at 16.8%.

A comparison of the number of visitor arrivals and the number of those using tourism establishments clearly shows growth in the number of tourists staying in alternative accommodations, that is, in villas and condos versus hotels. This is consistent with many markets such as Bali.

With tourist arrivals via the airport numbering 683,200 in 2007, much work remains to be done in terms of infrastructure in order to accommodate the growing the number of tourists.

Bangkok Airways has been addressing airlift by upgrading its fleet, retiring many smaller turboprop planes and replacing them with larger Airbus A319 aircraft.

Also now with overseas flights available, capacity is expected to rise by 62%.

Further, the Samui Airport terminal expansion of both the domestic and international areas was fully completed this year.

much debate about the need for a larger airport and landing strip on Samui. The current runway is 4,700

feet long, but larger aircraft from long-haul destinations require at

land. The airport in Surat Thani has a 9,000-foot runway, though terminal facilities remain limited and regional passengers are increasingly looking for door-to-door access on holiday trips.

There have been talks about relocating Samui Airport to the southern part of the island, but this is a long-term planning option at the moment.

With its bustling development, traffic currently relies on a primary ring road, which stretches around the island, though there are new roads to areas such as Taling Ngam, Phang Ka Bay and Thong Krut.

The opening of both Tesco and Big C has brought greater diversification from the highly centralized Chaweng Area than in the past.

The opening of the island's As with Phuket, there is first golf course a few years ago marked the arrival of limited new demand-generated facility growth in areas such as international schools, hospitals and tourism attractions. As critical mass is achieved with residential sales, this is expected to accelerate in the medium term.

While Phuket and Samui share many similarities, the latter is certainly at a stage much earlier in the cycle of development.

Phuket has Sarasin Bridge connecting it with the mainland and - barring any significant disruptions to air services - it enjoys many advantages over Samui in terms of relative ease in movement of tourists, commodities and an existing service economy to support and spur further growth.

Yet both Phuket and Samui have seen new development being pushed to outlying islands and areas as new tourism destinations.

For what is now being called "Greater Phuket", it has

been Krabi, Phang Nga Bay and Khao Lak. For Koh Samui, it has been Koh Phangan and Koh Tao.

Roads on both islands were not designed to carry existing loads or planned to cater to the sheer number of developments that they

do – and other infrastructure is also being stretched to its limits.

In the long term, it will be interesting to see how each island copes and manages this balancing act.

In my next column, I'll look at Samui's residential markets of the past, present and future, so stay tuned.
