Reef Squadron splashes down

BANG TAO: The Thai Dive Association (TDA), For Sea Foundation, and the Royal Thai Air force joined forces on November 24 to sink ten decomissioned cold-war aircraft in the Andaman sea, creating an artificial reef in Bang Tao Bay.

The ten-plane "Coral Reef Squadron", as it has been dubbed, is made up of four Douglas C-47 Dakota Skytrain planes and six Sikorsky S-58T helicopters.

The operation to sink the craft was carried out in co-operation with Sang Charoen Shipping Industry Co Ltd.

Slated to start at 11 am, the procedure was postponed for three hours owing to heavy rain and poor visibility. While sinking the first plane, the team encountered further difficulties when air became trapped in the tail section, causing it to float.

The team managed to resolve the problem by punching holes in the tail and wing sections of the plane, allowing the trapped air to escape.

Thereafter, the mission proceeded according to plan and the plane finally came to rest on a specially created concrete platform 22 meters below the surface. This newly fashioned artificial reef will become home to a variety of fish and coral.


The aircraft used to build the reef are arranged in a circle formation with two craft positioned in the center.

Following the successful sinking of the first aircraft on Monday, the plan, at the time of going to press, was to sink two craft per day, culminating with the final aircraft being lowered to the seabed today November 29, which will mark the official opening of the Sea Air Wreck. Minister of Tourism and Sport, Veerasak Kosurat, will preside over the opening ceremony.

saw active service in the Vietnam and Korean wars and were later used as part of HM the King's project to create artificial rain. This sinking of a squadron of military aircraft represents a world first for Phuket.

The TDA is hoping that the new man-made reef will provide a boost to tourism, while helping to protect Thailand's other natural coral reefs, which have suffered great damage over recent years as the result of the large

numbers of resort divers visiting

Mr Vittayen Muttamara, secretary of the TDA, told the *Gazette* that a survey conducted by the For Sea Foundation had discovered widespread degradation of the coral in the Andaman sea. The decay was caused for the most part by tourist diving, he said.

World-renowned for the beauty of its coral, the Andaman sea each year attracts thousands of divers keen to explore its reefs. To service this demand, while at the same time protecting the beauty of the coral reefs, the For Sea Foundation came up with the idea of building a manmade reef using airplanes.

The For Sea Foundation first considered using a decommissioned fighter plane that was stationed in Hat Yai.

However, Royal Thai Air Force chief Marshal Knogsak Wattana cautioned against the use of this craft, recommending instead the use of a larger number of bigger aircraft, which would provide a better environment for the formation of coral.

Marshal Knogsak subsequently sanctioned the acquisition of the Dakota planes and Sikorsky helicopters, which had long since been decommissioned and stationed in Lop Buri province.

In order to use the aircraft, however, the For Sea Foundation needed to secure approval from the US, which had earlier donated the craft to Thailand. This acquisition process took more than a year to complete.

Having acquired the planes, the For Sea Foundation then had to decide upon a location for the new reef.

In opting for Bang Tao Bay, the foundation calculated that by locating the new reef near to popular Koh Wew, the area would provide an attractive dive alternative to Phi Phi, Koh Racha Yai and Koh Racha Noi.

The total cost of the Sea Air Wreck project is around eight million baht, with the government footing about half the bill and the rest put up by sponsors.

Drunken villager confesses to brutal slaying of neighbor

KATHU: A Kathu man has confessed to the shooting and stabbing to death of a neighbor on the morning of November 23.

Under questioning at Tung Tong police station, Wichian Choosri, 38, stated that he killed 39-year-old Nitti Limboot while in a drunken rage earlier that morning.

Mr Wichian reported the murder to the police, who arrived at the scene off Wichit Songkram Road, Soi 4, in Tambon Kathu to find onlookers crowded around Mr Nitti's body.

Partially decapitated and lying face-up, the victim had been shot in the head and had had his throat slashed.

He had also suffered deep lacerations to his legs and arms inflicted by a rubber tapping sickle

Around him were hundreds of rubber saplings, some splattered with blood.

An investigation of the area uncovered one .38 caliber bullet casing on the ground in front of a small, one-storey wooden house located about 20 meters from where the body was found.

After Kusoldharm Foundation workers had taken the body to Patong Hospital, police continued their investigation at the scene.

Mr Wichian then arrived with 42-year-old local resident

Liam Thepkaew. Still drunk and covered with bloodstains, Wichian confessed to killing Mr Nitti in a fit of drunken rage.

Under interrogation at Tung Tong Police Station, he told officers, while still clearly drunk, that he had had a fight over politics with Mr Nitti a few weeks earlier.

When he saw Mr Nitti driving down the soi on his salaeng (motorbike with sidecar attached) towards the main road, he stood in the middle of the soi to block his path.

He wanted to "clear the air" and settle their differences, he told police.

However, when Mr Nitti refused to talk to him he pulled out a .38 and fired, hitting the victim in the head.

Mr Wichian then went back to his house to get a sickle, which he used to sever the victim's neck and slash his throat, arms and legs

He then went to tell his neighbor Mr Liam what he had done, he said.

However, police noted discrepancies in his story and will investigate further. They believe that the failure to recover a .38 caliber weapon at the scene may mean that another person was involved.

huket's natural beauty was further enhanced last week with the arrival of 36 Miss France contestants who came here to film a special segment of the pageant to be broadcast in France next month. The choice of Phuket as a destination was largely due to a collaboration between the Tourism Authority of Thailand's (TAT) Paris office, XL Airways and BEST Tours.

Between November 16-21, the Miss France contestants and their entourage, totaling 85 people, stayed at the Indigo Pearl Resort where they were based during their stay here.

The ladies were flown to Phuket on a special XL Airways chartered flight direct from Paris. XL Airways is due to start its operation of regular Paris-Phuket charter flights in December 2008. The weekly one-flight service will continue until April 2010 using a 364-seat Airbus A330-200, with

the inaugural flight to take place on 21 December 2008.

While in Phuket the contestants were kept busy with photo shoots and other pre-event coverage as well as sightseeing organized by the TAT and BEST tours. With the wide and varied media channels for the Miss France 2009 campaign in Phuket and the inaugural flight, TAT hopes that more French people will now choose Thailand as their next holiday destination.

For years, France has remained one of the most important European markets for Thailand's travel industry, along with the UK, Germany and Sweden.

Thailand welcomed around 351,651 French visitors in 2007, an increase of 9.92% from 319,910 the previous year.

The Miss France 2009 pageant will be broadcast on December 6 on TF1 to an estimated 12 million French viewers.

Toilet paper inferno a close call

CHALONG: It took firefighters about an hour-and-a-half to extinguish a blaze that broke out in a warehouse on Soi Sanjaotaead in Chalong at about 11:30 am.

Four firetrucks and a "cherry-picker" were dispatched from the Wichit and Chalong Fire Departments to the warehouse, located about 200 meters behind the Phuket Spa and the grounds of The Andaman Cobra Show.

Fueled by the highly combustible paper and its plastic wrapping, the fire roared back to life several times after firefighters seemed to be getting it under control.

One firefighter in the bucket of the cherry picker punched holes in the corrugated tin cladding of the warehouse so that water could reach the

Firefighters continued to douse the unburned merchandise to keep it from igniting and raced, under very dangerous conditions,

to remove as much toilet paper from the warehouse as quickly as possible to stop it catching alight.

One man high up in the rafters, dressed only in his underwear, bravely scooped paper from the blaze just meters away.

One gust of wind making its way inside the warehouse could have flared up the fire badly and left him with terrible burns.

The brave efforts of these men saved new homes located just meters away from the fire.

There were no reports of serious injury. It is still too early to estimate the damage caused. One firefighter said he suspected the cause was an electrical short circuit.

CCTV coverage expanded in Phuket City

B20M funding from province for 16 security cameras and 16 new buses

PHUKET CITY: More closedcircuit television (CCTV) cameras will be installed in the Phuket City area under a project with 20 million baht in funding from the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO).

The PPAO President Paiboon Upatising said the installation will start in the city's two largest recreational areas: Saphan Hin and Rama IX Park, also known as Suan Luang.

Phuket City Police will oversee the CCTV monitoring center. Phuket City already has a network of 16 CCTV cameras. installed under a 16-million-baht contract with telecommunications provider CAT Telecom Public Company Ltd. Similar security networks were established in Patong and Karon at the same time.

The 48 security cameras were announced as being fully operational in February 2007, but Phuket Provincial Police Commander Apirak Hongtong recently admitted that some units were not yet operating properly.

In a related story, the PPAO also plans to launch 16 new public buses to cater to students and other commuters.

Over 1,500 students have already registered to use the existing "Green Bus" service free of charge, while many schools have requested that the PPAO add additional routes to accommodate their students.

The authority also plans to organize a "musical fountain" at Saphan Hin as part of the New Year's Eve countdown celebrations to be held there.

As for the authority's "beachguards", after two rounds of bidding since the new administration took power, no company has yet been able to tender a successful bid for the 20-million-baht contract.

The problem is that the terms of reference for the contract are higher than before, with new requirements, such as certification of all beachguards and other conditions included to ensure "transparency".

If no single company manages to put in a successful bid soon, the PPAO will consider offering smaller contracts.

Those contracts would provide services in certain areas before the onset of the monsoon season in May, when surf conditions become more dangerous.



have just visited six countries in five months: Australia, Fiji, New Zealand, the Philippines, Taiwan, Vietnam, plus Thailand. In each country, I surveyed the cultural attitude towards wildlife as well as its impact upon it.

I have always known that local culture determines the status of natural ecosystems, an excellent case in point being Phang Nga Bay, where certain unscrupulous TAT managers and mass tourism operators sold out their integrity by choosing volume and profit over proper management of Phang Nga's tidal sea caves and

hongs – a delicate world treasure with unique and fragile qualities.

The actions of these "managers" reveal an utter lack of respect for their own country by turning these fragile ecosystems into a mass tourism party that has nothing to do with sea kayaking. Significantly, in 29 years, I have never actually seen one kayak in the bay that sustains their wealth as they trash their country's treasures. But more of that later.

My first trip was to Oceania. Ecologically speaking, Australia and New Zealand are pretty much as good as it gets. Both countries have iron-clad systems of agricultural checks, ensuring that not only cash crops but fragile ecosystems are protected from disease. In Sydney, the Rainbow Lorikeets did not so much as jump as I stepped out the door of my bed & breakfast. The next day, I got to photograph an Ibis in a downtown park. Australia has its problems, including agricultural siltation onto a dying Great Barrier Reef, but most of the countryside remains hospitable to wildlife.

If only the whole planet could enjoy the ethical standards

set by our southern hemisphere friends.

They may not be perfect, but the Kiwis and Aussies make a clear environmental commitment – strongly supported throughout the population. Do not forget that these environmentalists make up one of Phuket's major markets.

In Taipei, I didn't see a great deal: the airport, the Howard Hotel, and the Convention Center. It looked okay, but I didn't get to see the countryside. I do know some KMT types ate Tiger #6 from Khao Sok, and I'm one of those guys who asks, "What happened to the Formosans?"

I am happy to say that I did find some shops displaying Formosan traditional crafts and carvings, a very good sign. Blame it on the Aussies.

Fiji was just 50:50. I found linoleum flooring carpeting some reefs and I tried to buy a baby turtle off a Fijian. When he realized I wanted to release it back to the sea, he snarled, "Not for sale!" However, that is the exception, not the rule. I love Fiji and its friendly people (except on the rugby pitch). Most follow traditional Pacific culture that em-

phasizes a balance with nature. On Taveuni, if you want tuna for dinner, you jump in your canoe and go trolling; you won't be gone long. Gardens are green and full, and nobody wants for food.

Back in the '80s, a Korean fisherman went swimming in Suva Harbor. He was gobbled up at the dockside within five minutes by a 20-foot tiger shark. Unfortunately for the Korean, even Fiji's harbors maintain a healthy ecosystem.

I visited a pristine rainforest in the Suva highlands. The trailhead offered a spectacular view over Suva, and the Eco-lodge plays host to regular groups of ornithologists looking for a sumptuous variety of rare feathered friends. The most spectacular, like Lorikeets and musk parrots, fly right in front of your face.

Puerto Princesa is perhaps SE Asia's most "Eco" spot, but until its airport becomes international next year, I am forced to transit the Manila cesspool, literally stepping over nursing mothers with makeshift beds constructed out of cardboard boxes, sleeping on broken sidewalks. Fiji has no beggars, but SE Asia appears filled with them. While I tend to see the same beggars on Sukhumvit Road every time I visit Bangkok, that "Manila Mama" seems to have one more kid every year.

The brutal Spanish colonialists brought overpopulation, cockfighting and environmental devastation. Entire islands were denuded, reefs stripped, covered with silt and then overpopulated in the name of God. The Philippines may become the first country outside of Africa to suffer total environmental meltdown.

You certainly won't find many beggars in Singapore, but they've got plenty of bulldozers,

as much of the city state is built on reclaimed land. I have yet to figure out how a reef that's been bulldozed and then covered with high-rise foundations can be labeled "reclaimed".

I can't say enough about "Eco" Puerto Princesa, standing at the pinnacle of SE Asia's environmental awareness.


In many ways, it even surpasses the southern hemisphere and, most remarkably, it is in the Philippines. Our own TAT managers would benefit greatly from a field trip to Puerto Princesa to witness an example of sustainable prosperity.


Hanoi in Vietnam is a clean, emerging city, where old culture blends with new high-rise architecture. But Vietnam is hell for wildlife, if any indeed still exists.

I have been exploring Halong Bay since 1992 and Ba Be National Park since 1995 and I can safely say that I have seen more wildlife in Phang Nga in a single day than I have witnessed in Vietnam over the past 16 years. And as we know, Thailand's record isn't much to write home about.

When I first explored Halong Bay, the place was full of Tokay Geckos, some of my favorite animals. A family of Tokay live in my home, watching me upside down as I write. I have become intimately acquainted with their distinctive voice.

A few years later, I found a Vietnamese hunting them. I asked him what possible financial value a Tokay could offer. I had expected to hear some story about the exotic pet trade, but instead he told me that the Tokay were destined to wind up in a traditional Chinese medicine. The medicine trade must have perpetrated 4,000 years of animal abuse in support of its various mystical claims. I on the other hand, pre-

ferring a dose of reality, recommend you try Viagra. It really works and is far cheaper. Until reality conquers tradition, wildlife has good reason to fear us.

Halong's waters are an open sewer. Nothing of interest grows in them, and I have seen only two white belly sea eagles

Back in Phuket, our family is blessed. The little patch of jungle we rent is an isolated island in a growing sea of development where wildlife is cut off from other populations. It should be said that many developers, especially Westerners, actually

I watch squirrels skittering across my bamboo jungle, stealing bananas no human can reach. Our little jungle is host to at least one blood python, a reticulated python, a cobra, bamboo rats, blue-winged pitta, cane spiders, and brown frogs, proof that Phuket can still sustain our wild

population is adept at destroying wildlife, even if only in a soft

national parks, but, incredibly, the TAT actually encourages it. When I petitioned a former governor of Krabi to stop feeding the macaques in Talin, his response was an irresponsible, "It's good for business."

For crab-eating macaques, abuse starts with something as simple as feeding them bananas. The three important things to remember about feeding wildlife

- Human offerings are not part of their natural diet.
- The wildlife becomes dependent upon human handouts.

lems of all six of the countries I visited seem inconsequential compared with what I ran into in a well-known tourist trap during a group inspection trip. I usually wouldn't go to this spot, but an academic friend told me he had seen gibbons for sale on his research trip there two years ear-Sure enough, I wasn't on

But the accumulated prob-

the island two minutes before a hawker threw a baby gibbon into my lap, so young it was still in diapers. Its eyes were filled with terror from the days-old memory of its mother being shot as it lay in her arms.

This is the ultimate definition of "massacre" and it happens right in front of the eyes of the authorities, who, for some unknown reason, choose not to do their job. My professor friend was offered a gibbon for sale, and the ranger escorting him said it was okay because that gibbon was "just a pet".

I was never offered a gibbon, but the hawker did try to sell me a photograph. Fortunately, I had no money and therefore did not contribute to the animal trade.

Thanks to this evil practice, Thai gibbons are now rare. In an all-too-familiar scenario, three mothers holding babies are shot from the tree. Odds are only one baby survives the fall. What is truly criminal is that this trade operates quite openly, with the obvious blessing of the authorities.

The point is that we abuse wildlife all over the planet. Yet Australia, New Zealand and Puerto Princesa prove that it doesn't have to be that way. The solution lies in improving education, forcing the authorities to do their jobs, and in encouraging the general population to support conservation.

Locals tend to dismiss conservationism with an attitude of "this is my country", but if they are so proud, why do they make Thailand look so bad?

Thirty years ago, on the Hawaiian island of Waikiki, some fool speared a turtle and walked home with his catch, spear still in its neck.

The police said he was easy to find because every house he passed called 911. That is the measure of respect for wildlife we need to develop in Thai society if we wish to preserve wildlife for future generations.

Sure, there may be cultural differences, but that's my point. The Aussies and Kiwis still slaughter their cows, pigs and sheep, but beyond the farm fence things look pretty healthy.

So why is SE Asia's wildlife situation so dramatically different from that of the South Pacific?

close to home recently when a long-tail boat sailed in between our support boat at anchor and the beach and shot a macaque right in front of our guests. The bullets didn't finish the job, so they beached the boat and clubbed the monkey to death with a stone, all in a national park.



BANGKOK: The Criminal Court on November 20 sentenced 37year-old Jitrada Tantiwanichayasuk to eight years in jail for stabbing four schoolgirls with a knife at St Joseph's school in 2005. The sentence was commuted to four years because the defendant con-

The court said the defendant, who has a history of mental problems, will be sent to receive medical treatment at a hospital after serving the jail term.

In September of 2005, Ms Jitrada stabbed and seriously injured four students at the girls-only St Joseph's School in the center of Bangkok. One of the students was left in critical condition but later recovered. Jitrada escaped from the school on a motorcycle.

While working at a Bangkok restaurant, the restaurant owner alerted police after recognizing her from a police sketch. Jitrada allegedly told police investigators she had heard "an order from heaven" telling her to "do something" to rich Indians and Chinese because they had taken advantage of the Thai people.

Psychiatrists treating Jitrada after the attack diagnosed her as suffering from mental illness. Police said Jitrada had taken 500,000 baht from her mother several months earlier to prepare for the mission and planned to attack only the children of wealthy parents.

Nine killed at race track


PATHUM THANI: Nine people were killed late on the night of Saturday November 22 when a race car lost control and hit them at a race track in Pathum Thani.

Six people were crushed to death at the ring of the Bangkok Drag Avenue in Pathum Thani shortly before 11 pm. Eleven other injured people were rushed to hospital, where three later died.

Eye-witnesses told police that the race car lost control about 300 meters after leaving the start line. It collided with a concrete barrier before careening into a group of fans around the perimeter of the track. The race is a special annual event held to allow teenagers to race among themselves.

The driver of the race car, fled the scene.





Student stabber sentenced | Protest halts ThaiBev share plans

hai Beverage, the country's largest pro ducer of spirits and beer, decided on November 20 to postpone indefinitely the listing of its shares on the local bourse, following massive protests by anti-alcohol

Vichate Tantiwanich, executive vice president of the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET), said the filing was still incomplete and the firm wanted to delay completion of the process.

Due to the global financial crisis and increased market volatility, ThaiBev had also found it difficult to come up with an appropriate price for its initial pub-

It announced the indefinite postponement of its plans as more than 10,000 people rallied in front of the SET headquarters in Bangkok to oppose the listing.

Among the protesters were thousands of monks.

Back in 2005, the Thai drinks giant applied to be listed on the local bourse but its bid was turned down when Maj Chamlong Srimuang led similar protests against the stock-trading plan, prompting ThaiBev to turn to

Singapore instead.

Maj Chamlong did not join the recent protests, as he was preoccupied with the People's Alliance for Democracy's bid to bring down the Somchai Wongsawat government. Senior management sources at ThaiBev had earlier stated that its listing plan for the local bourse remained intact and that the protests were not unexpected.

Anti-alcohol groups have consistently opposed the listing of the company's shares on the grounds that it would further promote the alcoholic beverage industry and the consumption of its products. On the other hand, capital-markets advocates have insisted that trading of the shares should be approved and that the authorities should instead enforce the laws on drinking.

Vaginal piercing fashion puts Thai teenagers at risk

BANGKOK: The Public Health Ministry has warned against vaginal piercing and decoration with jewelery, saying it could lead to bacterial infection and cause severe problems in the uterus and kidneys.

Some patients have had to have their uterus removed after having vaginal piercing and adornment with unsafe objects, said Medical Services Department deputy chief Boonreung Traireungwararat.

The ministry issued the warning after it became a popular fashion among young Thai girls who believe that piercing their vaginas and adorning them with accessories would enhance their sexual libido and increase a partner's interest while having sex.

Mr Boonreung believes the piercing fashion has followed a trend popular among Japanese girls.

Most of the women who do the piercings want the decorative objects on their clitoris, but the unsafe processes used by many piercers could cause inflammation and bacterial infection, he said.

An unsafe procedure could also cause urethral stricture – a narrowing of the urethra caused by injury or disease, such as urinary tract infection or other forms of urethritis. "There is no scientific evidence that vaginal piercing would enhance sexual activity," Mr Boonreung added.

Debt collection turns deadly

NONTHABURI: A gang claiming to be debt collectors swooped down on an alley in Nonthaburi on November 22, attacking residents with knives and guns, leaving one person dead and three others injured.

Vehicles and other property were also damaged.

The 20-strong gang sealed off an alley in Nonthaburi's Muang district in the early-morning operation, before conducting their indiscriminate stabbing and shooting spree, police said.

Look out for the Smiley in the Sky



PHUKET: On the night of December 1, sky-watchers will be able to observe with the naked eye a rare astral phenomenon in which Venus, Jupiter and a quarter-moon will become aligned in such a way as to form the shape of a smile in the night sky. The best time to witness the celestial smiley will be between 6 pm and 8 pm.

Mr Sitichai Jantarsinrapin of the Bangkok Planetarium told the *Gazette*, "Venus and Jupiter are already aligned and on December 1 the orbiting quarter-moon will pass by, creating the image of a smiling face." This phenomenon is not visible every year, but only when the moon passes so close to these planets. Although not an unprecedented occurrence, Mr Sitichai said it is difficult to predict when we will next get to see the smile in the sky.

Ancient temple reveals buried treasures

here are many temples in Thalang, home to Phuket's largest settlements in days gone by, but one recently rediscovered temple is thought to date back 300 years to the Ayudhaya period. The old temple is now the site of an excavation by archaeologists.

Tribanyat Jariyalerpong, president of the Thalang Cultural Village, told the *Gazette* that Kanan Temple in Thepkrasattri Village 2 was possibly built at the end of the Ayudhya period which ran from 1677 to 1767.

From recent archaeological finds there, he surmises that the Burmese invasion of Thalang in 1785 forced people to bury their belongings on the temple grounds and run to the hills.

From that time forward, the temple appears to have been deserted for 150 to 180 years, possibly because of spreading disease or the collapse of the central government in 1809, he said.

In 1994, Mr Traibanyat and local volunteers started to restore the temple, which is home to three



stupas, called chedi in Thai

Confirming the authenticity and importance of the site, the Thai Religious Affairs Department in 2001 accepted it as a national monument.

Work is still going on at the temple grounds, which initially covered 4 rai but was expanded to 11 rai after the purchase of additional land in 1996.

The three chedi were used

for keeping the remains of the deceased, whose bones were stored in clay pots after cremation. The age of the large bricks used in their construction is thought to be anywhere from 150 to 300 years.

Also found at the dig were *hin tarnar*, stones taken from the sea to honor important people, as the temple is far from the sea.

Belongings of the deceased,

such as tea kettles, teacups, pots and other utensils, were also found. These date from the late Ayudhya period and early Rattanakosin era.


Until recently, these finds were kept in the Thalang Mu-

seum. However, construction of a two-story *ubosot*, or temple hall, is now underway.

Once completed the artifacts will be kept in a museum constructed at the temple grounds to house them.

Southern police capture ganja smugglers and pill pusher in war on drugs

olice in Chumphon arrested a methamphetamine dealer on November 18. The arrest followed the capture of three cannabis smugglers in the province the day before.

Other provinces around the South also saw major drug busts in the first month of the three month "war on drugs" that started on November 3.

After receiving a tip-off, Border Patrol Police had an informant contact Manas Chatcheua, 34, and ask to buy 70 ya bah pills. Mr Manat agreed to the sale at 350 baht per pill, a total of 24,500 baht. They agreed to meet next to Chumphon Technical College. When Mr Manas arrived, police moved in to arrest him.

Police said that Mr Manas confessed that he had been selling methamphetamine for around 10 years. He said that he bought the pills for 250 baht each and sold them on to local youths, mainly students and laborers, for 350-400 baht each.

Mr Manas was then sent to Muang Chumphon Police Station to be charged. Chumphon Governor Karan Supakijwi-lekakarn came to the station and helped to question Mr Manas.

Gov Karan said the case was particularly serious as Mr Manas was selling to school children. He urged police to capture other members of the dealing network.

The previous day, on November 17, acting on information from a source, Highway Police in Sawee District stopped a Sakon Nakhon-registered pick-up truck heading south on Highway 41.

The back of the truck appeared to be filled with sacks of fertilizer, but on removing the sacks police found two backpacks filled with blocks of dried marijuana. In total, there were 73 one-kilogram blocks.

Police arrested the three occupants of the truck, identified as 38-year-old Sanan Madngao and Sari Hatthapradit, 56, both from Trang's Kantang District, and Kanokanat Phumsawai, 40, from Muang district Sakon

Police said the three admitted that they had bought the drugs for 1,500 baht per kilogram from a contact in Laos, across the Mekong River from Sakon Nakhon. They said they were planning to sell the cannabis in the Trang area for around 30,000 baht a kilogram.

November 18 and 19 also saw major ya bah busts in Surat Thani and Narathiwat provinces.

Senior killing: An old woman was stabbed to death in her bed in Nakhon Sri Thammarat's Phomkhiri District in the early hours of November 17.

Iat Thongsamak, 71, an inlaw of Nakhon Sri Thammarat Democrat MP Samphan Thongsamak, was found by neighbors about 9am that morning in her house in Tambon Phrom Lok.

The scene showed signs of a struggle and police believe Mrs Iat tried to fight off her attackers before being overpowered. The attackers entered the house through a back window, police said

Mrs Nonglak Nakphalkang, 49, the victim's daughter, said that

200,000 baht in cash and a large amount of gold jewellery was missing from her mother's house.

Investigating officer Rengchai Rachkijja from the Phrom Khiri Police said that a neighbour heard Mrs Iat scream three times at about 3 am.

When the neighbors went outside to investigate they could see nothing amiss and went back to sleep.

Despite Mrs Nonglak's statement, Lt Col Rengchai said that nothing had been stolen from the house. Police are investigating a family dispute over inheritance as the motive for the killing.

"As none of the victim's possessions were missing, we are definitely ruling out robbery as a motive. Mrs Iat has nine children and they are currently locked in a dispute over the division of the family's 13-rai of land. They have already started legal action against each other at Nakhon Sri Thammarat Provincial Court and the

court is due to hear the case in 2010," he said.

Police are currently concentrating on this as the motive for the killing and have no other promising leads, he added.

Acid horrors: A man was left in critical condition after his wife through acid over him in Satun's Tha Phae District in the early hours of November 17.

Neighbors took Arun Thawasikho, 33, to Tha Phae Hospital suffering from severe acid burns to his head, face and chest. He was then sent for further treatment to Satun Hospital, where doctors said he was in critical condition.

Two other men, Praset Song-iat, 32, and Jaow Song-iat, 35, were also admitted with acid burns to their arms.

The men told police that as they were sitting drinking beer outside Arun's house in Tambon Tha Reua, Mr Arun's wife Anong Bualek, 28, threw acid over Mr Arun. Some of it splashed off, hitting Mr Prasert and Mr Jaow.

Mrs Anong later gave herself up at Tha Pae Police Station. She told police that she was suspicious her husband had a lover in Satun Town, as he liked to go there a lot.

The night of the incident, Mr Arun had been out drinking in Satun Town with his two friends, so out of anger she decided to throw acid on him. She has been charged with inflicting bodily harm on another person.

Officer shot: A brief gunfight left a police officer in Raman District in critical condition after suspected insurgents shot him in the head and arms.

Police Corporal Charin Saikeow and a group of fellow officers were ambushed by gunmen on a back road in Tambon Kota Baru on November 21, police said.

The two sides traded gunshots for about five minutes before the culprits retreated.

Charin and the officers were returning to their station after attending a road accident.

A few days earlier, on November 16, gunmen shot dead a former village chief in Tambon Bangpor as he and his eight-year-old daughter were leaving the mosque, police said.

Gunmen in a pickup truck drove up to Asem Waji, 49, and commenced fire with an M16 automatic rifle, letting off at least ten rounds

Three rounds hit Asem in the torso, and one in the head.


His daughter, who suffered a gunshot wound to her chest, was rushed to a nearby hospital.

Floods swamp Samui

KOH SAMUI: Annual monsoon weather has caused havoc to infrastructure around the island, leaving many areas flooded and impassable. Treacherous rains also necessitated the early closure of schools and businesses around the island.

Island residents have become increasingly irritated by the frequency of rising waters which cause disruption and pose a threat to businesses located along such routes.

"The rains at this time of year are entirely expected but it's disgraceful that the drainage issues have not been sorted out," said Ying Satayu, a shop owner near one of the trouble spots.

"I have put sand bags in front of my shop to protect it and now customers find it difficult to get into my premises. Aside from this, it presents such a hazard to people riding motorbikes or even small cars."

On taking office, the new mayor of Koh Samui, Ramnet Jaikwang, cited this problem as a priority and said that measures would be taken to limit the amount of flooding that occurs in many areas notorious for such problems.

A team of surveyors appointed by the mayor were instructed to identify all the areas that had been affected by the floods in previous years so that preventative action could be taken. Fourteen such areas were subsequently pinpointed and named in a report.

The mayor has been working on a solution to unblock drains and has pumps in place ready for any substantial collection of water. He has also put teams on standby to monitor such areas when heavy rains are predicted.

After the rains of 2005, when several areas were devastated by floods and the island was declared a disaster zone, many residents feel that the flood problems should have been corrected and further chaos avoided.

Mayor Jaikwang's team has asked for subsidies of 14 million baht to repair roads and install a more modern and efficient drainage system.

In the meantime, an emergency help line has been set up to assist residents in need during heavy rains in the flood-prone areas.

Marine park closed to tourists

ne of Surat Thani's more popular marine tourist attractions, and one where scenes were filmed for the movie *The Beach*, Angthong National Marine Park, has been closed down over concerns of safety.

The closure of the 102-square-kilometer park comes at a time when seasonal weather brings strong winds and rain which could pose dangers to small vessels or for people who intend to camp on the islands.

by the National Park and Wildlife Conservation Department of Thailand, which is the government agency charged with overseeing safety in all the country's national parks.

Chaisan Hiransalee, head of the Marine Park, has issued warnings to tour operators not to accept bookings from tourists asking to visit the park.

However, he states the closure is often ignored as tour operators have more interest in making money rather than taking safety into consideration.

Furthermore, Khun Hiran-

salee stated that, aside from keeping tourists out of harm's way, the closure also allows for the regeneration of flora and coral that often suffer due to the impact of visitor traffic on the natural environment. Maintenance teams also use this time to carry out vital repairs to park facilities.

The Angthong National Marine Park consists of 42 separate islands covering 102 square kilometres, and is one of the most popular venues for tourists visiting Koh Samui and Koh Phangan. The park will reopen on December 24.

Island ferry operators slash fares

Passengers benefit from drops in oil prices and tourism

SURAT THANI: Operators of the Seatran and Raja Ferry Companies have agreed to cut passenger and car rates for journeys to and from Koh Samui and Koh Phangan.

The decision was made on November 3, after executives of the two companies felt that oil prices had now fallen and were showing some signs of stability.

Earlier this year, the companies were forced to hike their fares and make cutbacks to their timetables in an attempt to remain in operation.

A meeting was held be-


tween the operators, Surat Thani government officials and the provincial government's Marine Transport Authority, under the order of Surat Thani Governor Pracha Taerat.

After strong encouragement from the Tourism Authority of Thailand, the decision was taken in an effort to promote more travel to and from the islands, especially during the forthcoming high season in which significantly lower numbers of visitors are expected due to the global economic crisis.

Fares between Donsak and

Koh Samui have been reduced from 150 baht to 110 baht, while rates for cars and SUVs have been cut from 420 baht to 320 baht. The passenger rate for the trip between Donsak and Koh Phangan is now 210 baht, down from 280 baht. Four-wheel drives and cars now pay 550 instead of 800 baht.

Although this represents a significant decrease, officials were quick to point out that these new fares are a reflection of current oil prices, and, as such, may rise again as and when the market dictates.





oo few of us know them. Which is strange, really: winemaking has flourished on the Cape Peninsula since 1663. Success, moreover, came quickly to the region and during the 19th Century prices in Europe for the much-prized Constantia whites matched those of Sauternes' Chateau d'Yquem, France's finest' dessert wine.

But then came the phylloxera vine-root destroying aphids, world wars, a 12-year alcohol consumption "Prohibition" in the United States, 'apartheid', ostracism and a 30-year trade embargo by the world community. The 20th Century was a write-off for South African producers; lovers of the grape largely forgot their

Wine-making struggled on, however, and today South Africa ranks among the world's top ten producers, with 6.4 million hectoliters in 2001.

But its vintners find themselves locked in a death grip over markets with other "New World" winemakers. Its products languish in the bargain bins of big retailers because even the nation's best producers remain mere cyphers for most wine drinkers, with no pre-eminent brands such as Australia's Pen-folds or New Zealand's Cloudy Bay to lead the

charge against consumer resistance. Desperate for recognition – anything to carve a niche By Marque Rome for themselves -

one group of winemakers in the Worcester appellation even decided to label their bottles in Braille.

While such is doubtless appreciated by the sight-impaired – and why aren't more producers following suit? – South African vintners shouldn't be reduced to finding clever gimmicks to sell wine. Over the past decade, scores for a number of South African wines have crept past the 90-point barrier in tastings, forcing critics such as Robert M Parker Jr and Wine Spectator magazine to pay attention. It's only a matter of time, perhaps, before the region becomes the next big thing.

In the meantime, South African winemakers tour the world trying to spread awareness (and vinous good cheer). One of their leading lights, Frank Meaker of Bovlei Winery, hosted a tasting in Patong recently, offering wares for consideration by vendors and meeting with the press. His wines have received several gold medals in recent years at the Michelangelo International Wine Awards, the region's premier event. Bovlei, distributed by BNK in Phuket, is in the increasingly well-regarded Wellington appellation, northwest of Cape Town, where the porous sandstone soils are "of limited fertility" – and thus perfect for wine.

Meaker, 53, is a Cape native, born in Cape Town, growing to maturity in Stellenbosch – heart of South Africa's first, smallest and most famous wine-

growing area – and attending Stellenbosch University. The university is for South African winemaking, as the great wine critic Andre L Simon once observed, "what Montpellier is to French viticulture," or the University of California at Davis is in the US –

> the center of research and spawning ground for future winemakers. It is where

the well-known Pinot Noir -Cinsaut hybrid 'Pinotage' was developed.

After school, he traveled the world, working in Pomerol where the velvet softness and spicy aromas of the Merlot grape have made Chateau Petrus the world's most valued red wine and at the Napa Valley's Robert Mondavi Winery, long California's most influential vintner.

"I was sent to see what the Americans were doing," he told me at Club Andaman Beach Resort amid the hubbub of a hundred or so schmoozing wine dealers. "They had a new vision; I brought home a few useful

He puts them into practice as production manager at Bovlei, a 101-year-old co-operative of 35 growers with annual output of over 8,000 tonnes. "Name a few businesses that are one hundred years old - anywhere," Meaker challenged. "You won't find many."

Something else one doesn't find many of are Shiraz wines as finished and appealing as Boylei's 2006 Shiraz, a gold-medal winner at this year's Michelangelo International. Redolent of wild berries and mint, this exotic, dark-robed, long-legged beauty persists long on the palate. Carrying 13.93 degrees of alcohol and five grams residual sugar, it is a lush, heady wine, superb of its type, and probably more accessible now than Hermitage of the same year. "Integrity is the key," to fine winemaking, Meaker said, averring that his goal is to win brand loyalty by affording buyers "\$15dollar bottles for \$10." He also thinks South Africans "keep it simple – don't over-complicate things" when approaching wine.

"At a California winery you might have four viticulturalists with an enologist," he said, "so straight. In South Africa it's straight."

Meaker is also proud of his 2007 Merlot: youthful, with slightly chewy tannins, it bids fare to be a stand-out after another year in bottle. Drier than the Shiraz, with only 2.1 grams of sugar, and slightly less alcoholic at 13.52 degrees, the Merlot's aromas suggest blackcurrants and mint – typical of the varietal.

Bovlei makes a full range of wines, including the 2006 Semi-Sweet Special Late Harvest white with 49 grams residual sugar, a rich, golden wine. Among the whites, Meaker wants to experiment more with Chenin Blanc – or "Pineau de la Loire" as it is sometimes called. Chenin used to be synonymous with France's Loire valley, but far more is planted today in South Africa than in France.


"It is most versatile," he said, and makes wines of great depth and complexity – whether unctuous, golden dessert wines or crisp, straw-colored whites. It can age for decades, gaining in complexity, developing bottle bouquet, and deepening in color. Bovlei's 2008 Chenin Blanc is aromatic of hay, tropical fruit and guava, and

the line [of command] is not finished dry with only two grams residual sugar and 12.36 degrees alcohol.

Regarding the current battle for global market share, in which Australia is leaving its rivals behind, Meaker observed that "production costs are generally lower in South Africa," and noted that "not many people know the Australians got most of their vines originally from South Africa." The South African economy, however, still sputters fitfully and the domestic market is oriented towards other beverages, thus SA wine sales lag several orders of magnitude behind Australia's. Nonetheless, as the rand "goes down and down," he said, "we sell more exports." Wine tourism to South Africa, also, "is so important" and has greatly helped both sales and promotion.

"People take away a bottle and then buy more [when they get back home overseas]," he said.

Meaker feels South African wines are under-priced globally – but what producer doesn't feel his wine is underpriced? In his case, however, he's probably right. Certainly the 2006 Shiraz is a heckuva bargain. Wine lovers can join in crying crocodile tears over the price.



Remembering Tom McNamara



Tom McNamara, founder of Baan Rim Pa restaurant, passed away on Sunday November 23 at the age of 62.

he last time I saw Tom McNamara, it was some weeks ago and he was sitting at his favorite table at Baan Rim Pa with his family and restaurant managers. He wasn't paying much attention to what was being said but was intent on listening to the popular piano music of Tommy Doyle, whom he brought to Phuket from Las Vegas in the early days of Baan Rim Pa, about 15 years ago.

I asked him how he was doing, knowing that he was in his seventh year of struggle against a deadly form of prostate cancer. "I'm fine," he said with his renowned bravado. "I'm getting ready for my demise. I have no problem with dying. I've had a good, full, interesting life. I have no complaints."

It is hard to believe that Tom McNamara, the world-class restaurateur who helped put Phuket on the international tourism map, has left us. The news that he lost his battle with death left many of us who have worked with him and considered him a friend at a great loss. We will all miss his innovation with new dining con-

cepts, which has lifted the standard of hospitality on the island.

"I think Phuket has come of age," he used to say. "It's time for this island to provide our guests with a more international dining experience that will encourage them to return year after year."

When Tom first arrived here 20 years ago, founding a collection of world-class restaurants was the last thing on his mind. Like many of us, he came to Phuket to retire.

For him that meant deep sea fishing and playing golf. He rented a modest bungalow on the cliff overlooking Patong Bay and had settled in to enjoy the rest of his life when he got news that his accountant had swindled his life savings. Tom was forced to reinvent himself again and open a small restaurant in the living room of his home, which he named Baan Rim Pa.

Tom was no stranger to the restaurant business. He grew up in a family of entertainers and those given to having a good time. The young Tom opened his first restaurant in the 1970s in a former warehouse district of Manhattan which became the trendy SoHo. This was also the time when he met his lifelong friend, Mauricio Laureri, who was importing Italian jeans to America, and who decades later would become his

ianca Goetz, a student with the British Interna tional School (BIS) in Phuket, recently represented Singapore in the fourth leg of the annual FINA/Arena Swimming World Cup Short Course Championships. When he found himself almost destitute and forced to return to the business he knew best, he recruited chefs and managers from Bangkok's Oriental hotel.

Baan Rim Pa may have been small and modest, but Tom was determined to provide the best Royal Thai cuisine found on the island.

Success did not come easy or quickly. Baan Rim Pa in the early days was located far from the action in Patong. There was no road connecting Patong with either the north island or even nearby Karon Beach and the south. But, gradually, he achieved the same success here as he had with his restaurants in other parts of the world. He added Da Maurizio, Joe's (in two locations) and Hung Fat's - all successful – and developed an international following among people who felt they hadn't experienced Phuket until they had talked to Tom and eaten at one of his tables.

What seemed to give him the most pleasure, however, was the foundation 'Phuket Has Been

Tai Chi Timeout

Telcome to the second in a series of Tai Chi Timeouts. Each timeout takes you through a single, easy-to-follow Tai Chi-Chi Gung exercise. One of the aims of Tai Chi is to develop the intrinsic energy (*Chi*) within the body through slow, rhythmical breathing exercises known as Chi Gung.

The ancient oriental martial art exercises are a great natural way to relieve tension from stress, and aches and pains from stiff limbs.

They can be performed whenever you want to unwind and loosen up, but are particularly beneficial when done in the early morning when the Chi is especially clean and light, relaxing and energizing the mind and body for the start of a new day.

In this particular exercise, inhale through the nostrils with a slow, even, steady breath, while slowly lifting the hands and opening the arms to maximum extension. On the exhale, first release any tension in the shoulders, relax the elbows and slowly allow the hands to return to your center (*Tan Tien*). Inhale and exhale each time to a slow count of eight.

Please note that when there is an upward movement of the hands there is an equal and opposite sense of sinking through the hips. Alternatively, when there is a downward movement of the hands, there is a sense of rising through the hips. Without an experienced instructor there to guide you, it's up to you to experiment, find the correct stance and to "feel" the sense of movement within the body.

Before beginning exercise, release the tension in the neck and shoulders by slowly rolling the shoulders forward and backward. Then roll your head in a circle – keeping your neck loose – first to the right, then to the left. Once you've completed five of these rotations place your hands over your *Tan Tien* and relax into a comfortable, forward-facing posture.

This Week's Exercise

Step 1: Place your feet shoulder-width apart, knees slightly bent, hips tucked gently under the spine (back straight). Relax your shoulders and hold up your head, but keep your neck relaxed.

Step 2: Begin the breathing exercise by slowly inhaling to the count of eight, relaxing your abdomen and allowing it to expand. Keeping your shoulders and elbows relaxed, slowly allow your hands to expand and open.

Step 3: Continue to inhale while allowing your hands to float up from the elbow without engaging your shoulders.

Step 4: Continue to inhale until your hands reach head height.

Step 5: When your hands reach head height, slowly relax the wrists and open the hands, keeping relaxed arms and shoulders and begin to exhale, allowing your abdomen to slowly contract.

Step 6: Continue to exhale to a count of eight while releasing any tension in your neck and shoulders.

Step 7: Continue to exhale while allowing your hands to slowly lower to your *Tan Tien*. When your hands reach your *Tan Tien*, slowly allow them to begin to expand and open while you begin to inhale. Allow the abdomen to relax and to slowly expand again. Continue like this for fifteen minutes.

Step 8: To complete the exercise, cross your hands over your *Tan Tien* and gather the Chi within.



His paintings document the rich mood of life in his home town. His palette is somber and his style approaches a blend of realism and surrealism.



I think I have a difficult job to do, but if I can do it well, then many other students from Phuket will be invited, and of course I will be asked to lead and I can achieve one of my dreams: to travel!

The mayor of the town of Vita has set up an annual folklore festival, in which folk groups come to participate from countries all around the world, and I'll be representing Phuket.

And my former language school in Enna has asked to make a cultural exchange with my school, Satree Phuket. It all depends on whether my job is done well. Of course I will inform readers upon my return.

Bond markets suffer in meltdown

henever there is panic in the financial markets, the proverbial baby often gets thrown out with the bathwater.

The turmoil may have been most noticeable in the stock markets of the world, but huge damage has also been inflicted on the fixed income (or bond) markets. The bond markets are, in reality, where the initial action took place since this all started as a credit crisis. Money flowed into government debt as it represented the safest refuge. Normally, a lot of this money would have ended up in bank deposits but since they were at the root of the problem, this was an area to avoid.

The "spreads", that is to say, the difference in yields offered on government debt as opposed to corporate debt, widened rapidly. Prior to the credit crunch, the spreads were very tight, but fear drove money into government bonds at the expense of corporate bonds. Some of this was deserved, as many companies, including banks and other financial institutions, were going to find themselves in difficult times.

However, many companies are not in financial trouble and will continue operations regardless of the current economic climate. Their bonds have been sold heavily for two reasons. Firstly, there was a flight to "quality" (sovereign bonds), and secondly, many institutional investors needed cash quickly and where better to raise cash than in the highly liquid bond markets. This debacle has left the bonds of many top-quality companies now yielding 10% and more.

This makes them very attractive investments, not only for their high yield but also for capital gains as markets settle and

value comes to the fore. Not everyone is a seller in these markets; pension funds are just one example where buyers are looking for real value. The target companies are those with long standing high investment grade credit ratings. It is still too early to easily identify opportunities in the lower quality arena, although those with the skill, and perhaps luck, will be more than adequately rewarded for their bravery. Conversely, fools rush in where angels fear to tread.

Many of the safest bonds are to be found in the utility sector (water, electricity); basically areas where there is always demand, limited competition and frankly, the nearest thing to a safe haven that investors are likely to find in these volatile times.

Henry "Hank" Paulson, the US Treasury Secretary, has changed policy on several occasions in recent months. Naturally, in these difficult times, he has become the target for a lot of criticism. Some of the negative comment has simply been political in nature and is understandable with a forthcoming change in the US administration. However, much is not deserved. As Paulson himself remarked, the economic situation deteriorated so rapidly and unexpectedly that policies have had to be adapted.

President-elect Obama is on record as saying that the public should not be concerned about the deficits for 2009 and 2010. He is correct, in that these deficits are going to be enormous. In addition to the financial sector and the automotive sector, we now have a new list – cities. The economic slowdown has adversely impacted the finances of many cities. They are already approaching the Federal government for assistance and more will join the queue. Many other sectors of the economy are also going to suddenly require "assistance". Perhaps Phuket could also add its name to the list; just tell them in Washington DC that we are in the South East.

The biggest problem is the sheer speed of the slowdown. For the first nine months of 2008 it was pretty much business as usual, but then October came along and changed everything. Spending patterns plummeted alarmingly. The drop was so abrupt

that many manufactures, and particularly the big car manufacturers, realized that they were not living in normal times.

The US, Europe and Japan have all now entered recession and the number of countries suddenly needing IMF (International Monetary Fund) assistance is rising rapidly.

The G20 Summit in America, where the heads of state of the world's leading twenty countries met in mid November, apparently achieved very little. In fact, the meeting only lasted six hours. What was important was that every country agreed that this was a common problem that required the co-operation of all countries to resolve. One other major agreement also reached was that nobody was going to adopt a protectionist position. Trade remains vital to the prosperity of all and there was an urgent need at the G20 meeting for a common consensus to resuscitate the stalled DOHA round of trade talks.

It is when countries understand that they share a common problem that can only be solved through co-operation that mankind can realize that we are all in this together. Unfortunately, the next meeting of the G20 is not due until April 2009, which begs the question: are the politicians giving this crisis the attention it deserves?

The iPhone is coming to town, but not in time for Christmas

ood news for techno-geeks: The iPhone 3G is coming to Thailand – legitimately – as the youngest of Thailand's trio of major phone operators, True Move, has sealed a deal with Apple to distribute the sleek must-have.

The bad new is that it may be months before the device arrives on our shores, so drop any plans of having one for Christmas.

A senior official at True Corp, which owns 75 percent of True Move, said True Move would work with Apple on the launch of the sleek new 'smartphone', which offers faster Internet access and improved email features.

Thailand is still in the testing stage for 3G networks, but meanwhile 3G iPhone users can surf the Internet via existing EDGE or GPRS networks, which are 2.5 generation mobile technologies.

Despite being years ahead with its coverage area and 3G deployment, AIS, who were in negotiations with Apple, seem to have dropped the ball with this deal. The reason True Move trumped AIS and number two carrier DTAC has nothing to do with 3G, but rather owes itself, it seems, to TrueMove having become a media conglomerate over the past few years.

Scooping up UBC after Shin Corp was sold off by former PM Thaksin Shinawatra to Temasek of Singapore, True Corp was able to corner the Thai pay TV market. With their abundant media distribution agreements and locally made 'Academy Fantasia' program, there is no lack of content to fill up the iPhone and possibly even a local iTunes store.

It is worth noting that True Corporation is a subsidiary of CP, Thailand's largest agricultural producer and one of the Kingdom's biggest companies. CP also happens to hold the franchise for Thailand's 7-11 convenience stores, which cover nearly every square kilometer of the nation. Who might be better as a partner for getting a product out to the masses, providing infrastructure and content delivery channels, and having a massive retail network with which to collect monthly payments of phone bills?

On top of all this muscle, True is among the few companies in Thailand to have WiFi hotspots at major shopping malls and other public gathering centers.

Because there are no public 3G networks aside from AIS's 900MHz service in Chiang Mai, the iPhone, which operates on the 2100MHz 3G, will not show blistering speeds or 3G content as it will be limited to an EDGE data service. However, True Move currently streams live TV, radio, music, movies and other services you would come to expect from a mobile carrier with an EDGE network.

It has yet to be disclosed what the price will be for the iPhone 3G. However, since Thai law prohibits any carrier from 'locking down' phones to their own network, it is likely that the iPhone will enter Thailand under the same terms and conditions as any other phone does, i.e., unlocked. And by subsidizing the price of the iPhone, True Move should be able to count on an acceleration in the growth of new service contracts, despite the fact that buyers can use the device on other networks.

With these factors working against excessive pricing, a legitimate iPhone is bound to be cheaper than the current asking price (at MBK and other phone shops) for pirated iPhones. A 3G iPhone smuggled from the United States currently costs around 29,500 baht (\$842) in Thailand. One from Hong Kong costs about 35,000 baht, since it offers an easier way to insert a local SIM card.

Although True Move appears to have won the iPhone deal, don't count out AIS and DTAC just yet, as a signed deal does not mean that True will have the 3G out in stores before anyone else. Commenting on the question of what happened to their rumored deal, AIS says the agreement with True Move is nonexclusive, leaving the door open for speculation that AIS may still be in negotiations with Apple.

Becoming a mother of kings

A personal memoir by HRH Princess Galyani (1923-2008)



s Mother Told Me is the personal story of the late Princess Mo-Lther (1900-1995) from her humble origins as a child of commoner parents in Thonburi to her eventual rank as mother to two Thai kings.

Recorded as a memoir by her only daughter, HRH Princess Galyani Vadhana Krom Luang Naradhiwas Rajanagarindra (1923-2008), it was originally published in Thai in 1980 as Mae Lao Hai Fang, becoming one of the most widely-read royal biographies.

The young Princess Mother,

or Sangwan as she was then known, grew up in a dilapidated one-storey shophouse in Thonburi. Both parents had died by the time she was nine.

She was presented as a retainer to the household of HRH Princess Valava Alongkorn as a means to an education, and at 17 was one of two nursing students selected to study in the United

One night in September 1918, the 69th child of King Rama V, Prince Ma-hidol, met Sangwan with a group of Thai students at the Boston railway station when he was studying public health at Harvard Uni-

They were engaged and married two years later in Bang-

For nine years after that, they moved between Siam, Europe and the United States, while the Prince completed his medical education.

Though the prince was a pioneer of modern Western medicine in Siam, he tragically

succumbed to kidney disease in

The Princess Mother then moved with her two sons and one daughter to Lausanne, Switzerland in 1933, and by 1935, due to a quirk of history, had become mother of two heirs to the throne of Siam.

Besides the story of her mother's life from 1900 to 1938, Princess Galyani included extracts from the Princess Mother's favorite works, from Pascal, Ro-usseau, Sartre and King Rama V.

The book contains over 100 photographs, mostly taken by the young Sangwan, among whose first purchases in the United States was a box camera.

Included are the first end-ofterm shots which were taken with the nursing students in 1916 and also those charting her family's travels across America, Asia and

A few facts about 'farang

spends even a few days in Thailand will Llearn at least one Thai word: ฝรั่ง farang. It's being used by Thais to refer to them – whether they're aware of it or not.

Farang is one of the first words that will stand out from the

jumble of Thai constantly spoken on all sides. People are most likely to be saying things like, "Come take this farang's order, my English is terrible," or "Help! I can't make head nor

tail of what the farang wants."

If you're in a place foreigners don't normally frequent, you're likely to hear it randomly shouted at your very presence, by staring children and adults alike.

For the most part, it's used version. harmlessly. Some people take it as an insult, but I don't. If somebody uses it like it's my name, I might let them know. Thais generally mean no harm by the word, even if they tend to overuse it.

The etymology behind the word farang is relatively clear, but some persistent folk etymologies muddy the waters. I don't want to get too much into tracing the history of the word right now, though.

The short version: farang doesn't come from the Thai word ฝรั่งเศษ /farangseet/ "Français", since its use predates the arrival

ny white foreigner who of caucasians in Thailand; nor does it come from the fact that white people have skin like the inside of a guava.

Likely cognates of farang are found in many languages and many countries, stretching from the Middle East out to Oceania. It was almost certainly spread by Persian

> traders across mainland Asia many centuries ago. Such traders arrived in Siam by the 16th century, bringing along with their wares the word farangi, meaning Westerner

or white man, from the Arabic word "faranji", and ultimately referring to the Germanic tribe the Franks, dating from the crusades, perhaps as early as the turn of the first millennium, AD.

Yes, that really is the short

The so-called farangs have shared their appellation with many things in Thai. The guava, known as ฝรั่ง farang in Thai, is actually native to the Americas and was most likely introduced to Southeast Asia by the Portu-

In the early 19th century, John Crawfurd wrote of a fruit the Thais called "banana of the Franks (Kloa-Farang)", or กลวยฝรั่ง /kluai

So the fruit gets its name from the foreigners who introduced it, and not the other way



The original Thai makok, as opposed to makok farang: the

It's not just guavas, though. Many of the things introduced by westerners are called "X farang", which is to say, "the farang version of X". Common ones include the following:

มันฝรั่ง /man farang/ = potato (มัน /man/ is a general word for tubers, thus potatoes are "farang tubers").

หมากฝรั่ง /maak farang/ = chewing gum (หมาก /maak/ is betel, thus gum is "farang betel").

หนอใมฝรั่ง /naw maai farang/ = asparagus (หน่อยไม้ /naw maai/ are bamboo shoots, thus asparagus is "farang bamboo shoots").

ผักชีฝรั่ง /phak chii farang/ = parsley (ผักชี /phak chii/ is cilantro/ coriander, thus parsely is "farang cilantro").

In addition to asparagus and potatoes, there are several more plant species not native to Southeast Asia that are known as the "farang" version of some other common plant. These include the daeng/= stir-fried morning glory following:

มะกอกฝรั่ง /makok farang/ A western-style olive, as opposed to the larger Thai 'makok'. Incidentally, the name of the city

of Bangkok is believed to derive from มะกอก (makok).

แคฝรั่ง /khae farang/ = Gliricidia sepium, a medium-size leguminous tree.

ตะขบฝรั่ง /takhop farang/ = A kind of flowering plant.

ผักบุงฝรั่ง /phak boong farang/ = Morning Glory, as opposed to the aquatic version (Ipomoea aquatica) used in the popular Thai dish ผัดผักบุงไฟแดง /phak boong fai

ประทัดฝรั่ง /prathad farang/ It is a shrub or small tree native to Brazil.

แพงพวยฝรั่ง /phaengphuai farang/ The Water Primrose, a herbaceous perennial plant native to the Americas and found on the margins of lakes and ponds.

Easy rentals breed dangerous rides

Because one can rent a small motorbike in Phuket for as little as 150 baht per day, it is an attractive transport option for many visitors. This is especially true given the exorbitant pricing of tuk-tuks and taxis on the island, with a ten-minute hop in a tuk-tuk costing the same or more than 24 hours' worth of motorbike rental.

Renting a motorbike here couldn't be much easier. For a start, most rental agencies could care less if a potential customer is actually licensed – or even knows how to ride. All one has to do is sign a contract, plunk down the money and hand over a passport as collateral.

Sometimes, it's even easier than that. One reader confided in the *Gazette* that he has successfully driven off with rented motor-bikes using only what he calls his "special ID", which is nothing more than a laminated, reduced-size photocopy of the identification pages of his passport. Of no official value, it nevertheless appears to the locals like a foreign version of a Thai ID card – and is accepted.

While motorbike rental offers good value and convenience, the obvious downside is that old Achilles heel called Safety. Even for the most cautious and experienced rider, potential tragedy is always lurking around the next corner. In addition, some unscrupulous operators also charge renters for "damages" they didn't cause.

Recently, Kathu Police Superintendent Grissak Songmoonnark said that about 60% of motorcycle accidents in Patong involve unlicensed foreign riders. This is a sad state of affairs, though it no doubt contributes significantly to the high occupancies in our local hospitals.

Besides reducing the number of tourists who leave the island maimed or in body bags, there are other good reasons for taking a more serious approach to better regulating the motorbike rental industry.

First, it's against the law to rent a motorbike to anyone who doesn't have a Thai license. Unfortunately, no police station on the island chooses to enforce this particular law.

Second, rented motorbikes are increasingly the transport of choice among the island's criminals, especially snatch-and-ride bandits like "Nop" Tongboon who was finally arrested in September and charged with multiple counts of grabbing women's shoulder bags and knocking the victims off their bikes, resulting in serious injury.

Despite there being several good reasons to better regulate this industry, don't expect it to happen soon. After all, as past news reports in the *Gazette* have revealed, some of these agencies, at least in history, were owned and operated by police officers. One can only hope that such is no longer the case.



Ticked off at tuk-tuks

I am a frequent visitor to Karon, Phuket where I find the stranglehold on transport by the tuk-tuk operators intolerable.

The beach in Karon extends just over one kilometer south from Karon Circle. Within that strip, there are now seven 'taxi, tuktuk stations' occupying all the public beach shelters as well as several makeshift huts. The number keeps increasing. Up to a

dozen people occupy the bigger stations from 8am–8pm. After 8pm, the tuk-tuks join the hundreds of others jamming the streets of Patong looking for business.

Some Thais say that the purposes of the tuk-tuk stations are: (i) to divide the tourist strip into zones for transport teams to monopolize; (ii) to define turf for touting purposes; (iii) to warn off the driver of any 'outside' vehicle who is seen parking in a space controlled for exclusive use by the team; and (iv) to ensure that no other operators (such as metered taxis, motorcycle taxis, and tuktuks or unlicensed taxis not affiliated with the control group) are able to pick up passengers.

Within each stand, or team, there is a queue to determine who will take the next fare.

Although the monopolies deny tourists access to any alternative means of transport, thereby enabling the exorbitant fares, the system actually doesn't work in the tuk-tuk operators' interests either. When a tuk-tuk driver drops a passenger, he has to return empty to his home station and face a long wait in a long queue for his next piece of business.

It is obvious to most tourists that they are being exploited, so many rent a motorbike instead of dealing with the 'take-it-or-walk' tuk-tuks. You can rent a bike for a week for the cost of just one round-trip (800 baht) to Patong, a distance of about 6 kilometers each way.

The transport cartel is clearly not in the public interest and is highly detrimental to the tourism business not only for Karon, but also for Phuket as a whole.

Phuket: a province with promise



Governor's Letter

Phuket recently welcomed Preecha Ruangjan as the province's new governor. This week's Governor's Letter is the first to be published in

the Gazette since Mr Preecha moved in to his new office at Provincial Hall on October 20. Mr Preecha is a native of Pidjit Province, where he also held the position of governor. Here, he talks about his first impressions of Phuket and some of the issues he plans to address. Compiled by Nick Davies.

ve been in Phuket about one month now and I can already see that most of my work will concern operating Phuket as a tourist destination, which is very different to the issues I had to deal with as governor of Pidjit.

The predominant issues I am faced with here are to do with drug offenses, public health, traffic, rubbish collection, waste water treatment and conserving the environment. The quality and cleanliness of food is also a major issue because we have to ensure that visitors to the province have good dining experiences wherever they go.

Phuket has a registered population of 325,000, which is about average for a province of this size, but there are many more than that actually living here. Add to that the five million visitors who come here each year... and we can see that the job of ensuring enough food and produce for everyone, without relying heavily on imports, becomes an exceptional task. However, if Phuket didn't have tourism as a source of income, the province would have difficulty prospering.

People see Phuket as a paradise island, so we have to ask ourselves what makes that so. If we put ourselves in the shoes of a tourist, the first thing we think about is Phuket's natural beauty; clean water, beautiful beaches and so on, in a tropical setting.

Secondly, there is the attraction of Phuket's culture and the traditional way of life. Many tourists come here because they want to experience that. In fact, many tourist destinations around the world are popular because they have preserved aspects of their culture for tourists to expe-

Thirdly, tourists come here because of the warm welcome they receive from Thais. When tourists are welcomed with a smile, it makes them feel safe. A smile costs nothing. There's no investment.

However, the island's natural beauty is already rapidly disappearing for the sake of high profits for a few individuals. This is one of the first things we have to take care of because if the destruction continues, Phuket will no longer be an attractive place to visit.

Nature has a way of healing itself, just like a cut on the skin that eventually turns to a scar and fades away. If we just leave the environment alone for a while and allow it to recuperate, a balance will return. The less we interfere, the better.

Development must be restricted. Those who are building properties without regard for the environment have to realize that if they do not stop developing in a way that damages nature, they are ultimately destroying themselves because tourists will no longer come here.

Phuket is a very small place. Imagine a room designed to hold ten people – with 100 people staying in it. Very soon that room will become uninhabit-

So we have to ask: is Phuket full yet? If so, then we have to think of new, sustainable ways to keep the island inhabitable. For example, the owner of a hotel with 200 rooms should not be thinking of expanding to 2,000 rooms. Rather, he or she should be thinking in terms of improving the quality of the existing rooms and the quality of the guests the resort at-

A few decades ago, Phuket was a world export hub for tin. It also had a very strong culture and unique way of life, but with so many international influences, that has all changed now and many traditional practices have simply disappeared. These days, if you want to find out about the old Phuket way of life, you virtually have to dig it up.

I would like to see some of those traditional aspects of Phuket life return and be celebrated in the form of tourist attractions. I would like to see a shopping street developed in Phuket like those in other countries where cars are not allowed to go. Not another Soi Bangla that's not the kind of culture I'm talking about - but a walking street, where people can shop and experience traditional ways of life. Staff would be in traditional dress and customers could sit and enjoy things like coffee prepared in the traditional way.

For this to be achieved, the younger generation have to see themselves as ambassadors of Thailand and Thai culture. Tourists fly directly to Phuket, so for many of them Phuket is Thailand. The idea is to encourage repeat tourists, and the best way to ensure that is for people to come here, have a good experience and then go back home and tell the people they know. That's the best way to market Phuket.

Native Phuketians are very few. Most people living and working here are from elsewhere, but it's important to preserve the way of life for Phuket natives. We need to initiate cross-training projects and workshops that encourage people who make their living from tourism to make it sustainable – not to overcharge tourists and not to commit crimes against tourists.

Tourists need to feel safe when they come here. They need to know that they can have a worry-free holiday and relax at the beach without being disturbed. The shouldn't have to worry about thieves, and they should feel that the police are their friends. Locals must help each other by not allowing criminal activities to take

I know that tourists are often forced to pay too much when they shop here. This gives them a bad feeling and they relate those bad experiences to friends when they go back home. The opportunist culture of overcharging is self destructive, so we have to change that. Don't forget that what we do today is for our children and their children.

Apart from tourism, Phuket is a producer of export products, such as rubber and fish. Breeding fish for export is something we are currently working to expand and improve by working with other countries, such as

Malaysia, Singapore and Brunei.

As for continuing with the projects that my predecessor Mr Niran Kalayanamit was overseeing, such as the planned conference facilities and other large projects, I have yet to take a close look at all the plans, the investors and their involvement before go-

Even though Phuket is a small province, it makes a huge financial contribution to the central government because of the island's tourist industry, but the province receives comparatively little funding for sufficient infrastructure in return because that funding is based on the number of residents registered as living here. As I mentioned earlier, Phuket has a registered population of just over 300,000, but in reality the number of people putting demands on the island's infrastructure and facilities is at least ten to twenty times that

With such demands on facilities such as water supply and treatment, and all the refuse that is created by so many people, Phuket needs a lot more funding and investment from the central government.

I aim to demonstrate that Phuket should be considered a specific economic zone; not one that is based on the number of registered residents, but one based on appreciation of how much Phuket contributes to the country's economy. Without such investment, Phuket will not prosper in the long term.

Rally Rather Splendid

place in February next year: the Hero 4x4 rally, which will begin in Singapore, visit Phuket and Chiang Mai, hit mainland China and end in the seedy gaming center of the Far East, the Chinese territory of Macau, on March 8.

The event was originally part of the London-Cape Town rally, which was opened to modern 4x4 vehicles as well as classic cars in 1998. Today, the Hero Club has some 2,000 members, the great majority of whom have competed in at least one major classic car or 4x4 event.

The rally will run over a period of 30 days, including six rest days and will cover roughly 9,450 kilometers. It is open to any modern four-wheel drive SUV. Although modifying the vehicle is not required, the organizers recommend ensuring the suspension is in good order, particularly the shock absorbers.

But this is no grueling, dayand-night test of endurance. The crews convene at the legendary Raffles hotel in Singapore - no doubt with a few Singapore Slings to set them up for the impending journey – where their vehicles will be scrutinized and registration will take place.

The event begins gently, with a short run on relatively easy roads through busy but often beautiful rural landscapes, affording glimpses of scenic and historic places seen by relatively few tourists.

The following morning, it's another quick drive up the expressway to Malaysia's capital, Kuala Lumpur, arriving midmorning. For the rest of the day, the intrepid crews are free to explore and shop. In the evening, they are treated to a sunset supper in the revolving restaurant of the slender Menara KL Tower.

Their luxury hotel in KL is one of Malaysia's finest: the Mandarin Oriental. After taking in the picturesque Cameron High-

unique event is taking lands and Penang, it is onto Thailand, where, for the first few days, the crews wander up the beautiful Andaman Sea coast, stopping here and there for a swim or for a fresh-fish lunch at a beach shack. They have a rest day at the Rayavadee resort, before checking into the Sheraton Grande Laguna Phuket.

> On day eight, the 4x4s follow the road along the Andaman coast north to Ranong, where there are views across the water into Burma. They take a scenic secondary mountain road across the isthmus, ending the day at the Novotel Resort hotel on the Gulf of Thailand near Chumphon.

> They then head north up the Gulf of Thailand coast to Bangkok, where, after a day of rest, they take a less-traveled road into Cambodia, hugging the shore between the coast and the Kardamon Moun-

> A loop around Chiang Mai, where their luxury accommodation is The Chedi, also forms part of their itinerary. From there, it's a very early start, partly because of the time it will take and partly to see the sunrise from the top of Doi Ithanon, Thailand's highest mountain. The rest of the day will be spent enjoying the wonderful roads and scenery, including a superb 20 km stretch of jeep trail, and stopping at remote hill villages. Taking in parts of Laos and Vietnam before crossing into China, eventually the crews will take advantage of China's expressway network to travel to Zhuhai, a city just outside Macau.

> Here, the adventure drive closes with a ceremonial finish, before they hand the 4x4s over to a shipping agent to be returned home. They will then transfer by coach to the Westin Resort in Macau, a luxury golf venue away from the main casino centers.

he annual Phuket International Sports Fishing Tournament took place in Chalong last week. The three day tournament, the biggest event of the fishing calendar in Phuket, attracted teams from all over the world.

The biggest winner of the tournament was Walter Dreier from Austria, whose team, 'The Rat Pack', won the trophy for the most points overall. Walter said, "This is the culmination of years of work and I am really pleased."

As well as Austria, there were representatives from Norway, Canada, Germany, Hawaii, Ireland and Singapore.

'Team 99' from Germany and Austria took home the prize for the biggest Sailfish, at approximately 1.5 meters, but did not take home the fish itself as it was under the mandatory size of 1.75 meters.

The biggest winner of day three, the final day, was Team 'Thai 2on' who caught not only the biggest fish of the day but also the biggest Wahoo, at 12.2 kg, of the entire tournament.





Construction otorists heading

along the bypass road towards Thepkrasattri Road cannot fail to have noticed the gargantuan development destined to become Outlet Village Phuket.

With a total investment of over a billion baht, the development is divided into two parts. The first part is a collection of ten one- and two-storey buildings consisting of offices and restaurants and occupying nearly 19,000 square meters.

The second is the Galleria, which will be made up of five separate buildings, covering around 4,000 sqm of retail space, selling mostly discounted branded goods in what is described by the developers as a "factory outlet".

Construction of the Outlet Village mall is being managed by Movida Co Ltd and the design concept has been described as "modern".

The project is under the ownership of Outlet Village Mall Co., Ltd, which already has similar ventures in Pattaya, Krabi, Cha Am and Khao Yai.

Work started in March 2006 and was scheduled for completion by the end of the year. However, unseasonal weather has delayed construction. A spokesman for Movida Co stated that the project is about 40% complete and should be finished early next year.

Planning a property development project in Thailand

hailand's continuing economic growth and thriving tourist industry have caused a noticeable revival of the property development market, and the steady influx of tourists and investors means there is growing demand for new accommodation and recreational property developments. As such, property development has become an attractive business venture to those with cash to invest.

However, property development is a complex process, and unlike some other businesses, involves several intricate steps and solid financial management.

Property development is certainly not for the faint hearted and requires just as much effort, if not more, than any other businesses to yield a healthy turnover. The good news is, that with good planning and a healthy dose of hard work, property development can indeed be very profitable for the developer.

This article aims to provide a helpful guide for investors planning to venture into property development projects in Thailand. There are various types of property development so it is essential to identify at the onset the end goal of the project. This is essential because it will help you to identify a host of variables that will influence the viability and direction of the project.

In this article, we will concentrate on property or real estate development as opposed to land development or 'fixer-uppers'. Property or real estate development can be defined as the construction of physical buildings on raw land. It can take the form of residential, commercial, institutional, recreational or industrial projects.

The property development process

In general, a development project can be broken down into five stages. They are, in respective order, inception and feasibility, design, tendering, construction, handover and maintenance.

This article will focus on the first stage, which is crucial, as it will guide the decision making throughout the development and will show early on whether the

project is worth the projected time and effort. Moreover, it will provide the strategic framework with which to establish the subsequent development stages.

Project inception

The first thing to do is to evaluate your finances and draw up a budget outline for your project. With this in mind, you can then search for a block of land with potential for development. It is a good idea at this stage to work with a team of consultants to provide you with the needed expertise in data gathering and assess-

You can either have a development manager who can coordinate the whole process or you can liaise individually with a number of advisers, which may include a lawyer, architect, quantity surveyor, urban planner and estate agent. They will be there to provide you with initial advice on the property and the marketability of any possible development. This is also the stage in which you, together with your advisers, identify your project objectives.

Land investigation

The next stage is to conduct a legal and ground investigation of the land. All issues concerning the land must be ascertained and assessed including ownership, title,

encumbrance, easements, zoning laws or ministerial regulations, and land capacity. These are the crucial issues which may affect land acquisition and what or how much you can build on the land. This is also a good time to find out what licensing will be required for your proposed project and whether you will need a property allocation license for the subdivision of separate plots.

Environmental regulation compliance

Environmental regulations are becoming one of the prominent issues facing property developers today. In late 2007, the Office of National Resources and Environmental Policy and Planning issued a new regulation requiring every new property project to plant a tree at least five meters in height and width for every air conditioning unit between 12,000 and 24,000 BTU. Also, a condominium project in Thailand which has more than 79 units or housing projects with a land area of more than 100 rai will need to apply for an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA).

Smaller projects may also need to have an Initial Environmental Evaluation (IEE) done.

Project brief

After ascertaining and evaluating land viability for the development

project, you will then need to set up a 'User's Requirement' in the form of a preliminary project brief. This is where you examine and assess what the market wants in that area in order to build something that would sell or lease well. User's Requirements are works in progress and are progressively refined into a detailed project brief throughout the design and tendering stages, so do not be too concerned if you haven't figured out exactly what it is you want to build at the on-

Feasibility study

The feasibility study will essentially identify the financial viability of the project and establish the potential for profit in relation to the risks involved. Factors to consider include, among others: time scales, costs for consultants, cost of construction, as well as the likely sale value and the profit margin you want to make.

There is a lot of software available today that can help make this part faster, cheaper and easier. A project's success depends on this feasibility study as this is what allows you to make an informed decision.

Project structure

The final step is to outline the project organization and management structure. The players in the project should be identified and their roles delineated. This is important in the development process as it sets out accountabilities and provides a framework in which the players in the organization can work and effectively contribute to achieve the final goal.

Final word

The planning stage of any property developments is crucial and requires a lot of hard work and perseverance. Property development is an inherently risky business as capital expenditure is often high and liquidity is, by nature of having property as its main asset, extremely low.

Financial management is decisive to the success of a development, and good financial management is in turn dependent upon good planning of the technical aspects of the project.

At least with good planning, you will know early on whether to continue on with the project and proceed to the next stage.

hen the all-pool-villa hotel Phuket Pavilions opened a few years back, one of their key positioning points against larger, upscale competition was, "no welcome drinks, no buffets and no tan line".

Now, meet the sexy and provocative world of design and boutique hotels, where size really does matter and small rules.

Looking back at the evolution of these types of hotels, the emerging tide shift was clearly the entry of Twin Palms.

The hotel launched successfully without the advantages of a beach-front location or the backing of a large international management chain.

On top of that, it couldn't even boast having pool villas, yet the hotel created a buzz in the local community as well as among overseas visitors, who raved about its unique design and how it reflected their lifestyle ambitions.

Financially, the hotel became a screaming success story, eliciting a league of return guests. Its occupancy and average-rate performance was envied by many of the island's elite-brand hotels.

Page forward into more recent times and scroll back into the Greater Phuket landscape, where hotels such as Aleenta, just over the bridge in Phang Nga, and the Sarojin in Khao Lak have wooed investors and guests by presenting a stylish image.

The developers came up with innovative designs and styles for the hotels, effectively enabling them to get approval from the bank for the projects.

Just last year, the stylish design of the Department of Architecture's Amata Luphai-boon at Sala Phuket captured the imagination of a new set of tourists. They are looking for a more personalized, tailor-made holiday arrangement as opposed to the

brand, its Bill-Bensely designs, the small number of villas, and attention to artwork will put it in competition with larger luxurypool-villa resorts like Banyan Tree and Trisara.

In Kamala, Cape Sienna, which is set to open next year, is also carving out a unique offering. These additions will give visi-

tors to Phuket a lot more freedom of choice.

Yet another new entry about to start construction is the Langham Place Resort & Spa in Kalim. The resort is a 78-key, all-pool villa, which was designed by Clint Nagata of Blink Designs. As with its flagship hotel

in Hong Kong, the new Langham will highlight original artwork and introduce to the market place a number of ground-breaking service innovations.

Andrew Jessop, who was a mainstay at the Sheraton Grande in Laguna for a number of years, is co-ordinating new ideas into this hotel. It promises to be stylish and cater to a more demanding client base.

Any rundown of boutiquedesign hotels wouldn't be complete without including the granddaddy of 'em all: The Yamu.

This iconic Philippe Starck/ Jean-Michel Gathy collaboration has been slow into the ground but is now looking at opening in 2009 and may give birth to the concept of Phuket Luxury 2.0.

While the current benchmark for chicness is the Amanpuri, the Yamu will offer a truly new concept for accommodation options in Phuket and looks to be the cream of the crop in the years ahead.

On the institutional boutique front, there are rumours that Starwood's W Hotels is coming to Phang Nga, however no announcement has been made yet. Over the past year, a number of lifestyle brands have been taking hard looks at Phuket, including Per Aquum, Kor/Viceroy, and Nikki Beach.

Globally, even the conservative market leader Marriott Hospitality, which has luxury brands such as Ritz Carlton and Bvlgari under its umbrella, is now spinning the 'Edition' brand in partnership with Ian Schrager, who is the one of the godfathers of hip, modern-lifestyle hotels and was behind the success of the Morgan's chain.

To sum it all up, in the growing age of long-tail customized consumer experiences, even the staid hotel market is starting to take heed of demand and is offering a broader scale of options to give guests more intimate experiences when they travel.
