

HAPPY BIRTHDAY

n the most auspicious occasion of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej's 81st birthday on December 5, the *Gazette* offers His Majesty thanks and praise for his guidance during troubled times and his life of innumerable achievements.

While most readers know of HM The King's work in such fields as water supply, economic theory and animal rights, some might not be aware that His Majesty holds patents for several inventions, and was this week recognized by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) as a champion of intellectual property protection, when he received WIPO's first Global Leaders Award on December 1, 2008.

HM The King was granted his first patent in 1993 for a system to resolve water shortage problems in the dry season, making him the first member of the royal family to obtain a patent. The Department of Intellectual Property, under the Ministry of Commerce, has since granted patents in His Majesty's name for a number of innovations, including Chaipattana aerators, royal rainmaking and the use of palm oil as a fuel.

HM The King now owns over 20 patents and 19 trademarks. Many of his inventions have generated concrete benefits for Thai communities, having been put to practical use in a range of rural development projects in Thailand.

HM The King this week received recognition as a champion of intellectual property protection when HRH Crown Prince Maha Vajiralongkorn represented His Majesty in receiving the Global Leaders Award from WIPO Director General Francis Gurry.

The WIPO Global Leaders Award, which comprises a citation and a medal honoring the

recipient, recognizes leadership and personal engagement in promoting intellectual property at national, regional and international levels.

It also rewards exceptional personal creative and innovative activities, and use of the intellectual property system to protect these works.

Established by the WIPO Convention in 1967, WIPO is a specialized agency of the United Nations and now has 183 member countries.

The organization is dedi-

cated to developing a balanced and accessible international intellectual property system, which stimulates innovation and contributes to economic development.

The importance of intellectual property as a policy tool to promote development has been a key feature of WIPO Director General Dr Kamil Idris's vision as head of the organization since 1997.

Dr Idris has campaigned extensively to enhance awareness and understanding among global leaders of intellectual property and its strategic importance in promoting economic, social and cultural development. The new WIPO Global Leaders Award recognizes HM The King's contribution to the realization of this vision.

On behalf of all our readers, the *Gazette* congratulates His Majesty on this latest in a long and varied list of impressive achievements, and joins with all Thais and foreigners in extending to him our sincerest wishes for good health and a long life.

Merit making for HM The King's birthday





ast week organizations and citizens all around the island held meritmaking ceremonies and celebratory events in honor of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej's 81st birthday, Friday December 5.

At Chalermphrakiat School in Phuket City December 1, police, monks and local people, as well as 10 local organizations, held a merit-making tree planting ceremony.

In Cape Panwa at the Royal Thai Navy Third Fleet headquarters on December 2, crowds were treated to a sea rescue demonstration by the Third Fleet, a brass band performance and a military demonstration by Phang Nga sea soldiers. Vice Admiral Narong Tetwisan, Commander in Chief of the Royal Thai Navy Third Fleet, then presided over a Royal blessing ceremony

on the beach. Following the ceremony, 382 sea turtles and sea shrimp eggs were released into the sea.

At Mai Khao Beach, 500 people planted 999 mangrove plants to make merit. Representatives from Tambon Mai Khao administration, Phuket Natural Resources and Environment Provincial Office, the Royal Thai Navy, as well as students from Phuket Polytechnic and Satree Phuket School took part in the proceedings.

Governor urges Phuket police to squash trade in sex and pirated goods

PHUKET CITY: Fearful that foreigners will view Phuket as a "sex tour" destination and center for trade in counterfeit goods, Phuket Governor Preecha Ruangjan has urged police to take a more serious approach in enforcing anti-prostitution and intellectual property laws.

At the monthly meeting of the Provincial Committee for Social Stability, held in the meeting room at Phuket Provincial Hall on November 27, chairman Gov Preecha told fellow board members that a recent night tour of Patong Beach convinced him that trade in sexual services and counterfeit goods was widespread and openly conducted there.

"Phuket is a world-class destination that attracts a great deal of tourists who come here to relax. I don't want them to get the impression and spread the word around the world that Phuket is a sex-tour destination like Pattaya," he said.

In order to protect Phuket's reputation, he asked police to do a better job at enforcing antiprostitution laws – especially in Patong.

On the issue of intellectual property law violations, Gov Preecha told police the trade in counterfeit CDs and other pirated goods was widespread in Kata as well as Patong.

He urged police to take a more proactive approach by arresting violators without waiting for the copyright holders or their authorized representatives to turn up and request enforcement.

The crackdown should begin right away, he told police officers at the meeting.

Hospital staff crisis continues



PATONG: Service at Patong Hospital continues to suffer, with no doctors on its permanent staff and no reinforcements expected until the middle of next year.

Hospital Director Dr Taveesak Netwongse explained that the 60-bed hospital continues to get by with a skeleton crew of doctors on loan from other staterun hospitals including Vachira Phuket Hospital, Thalang Hospital and some in other provinces.

The last of Patong Hospital's six doctors resigned in September. The walkout began when two doctors gave up their positions, saying they wanted to resume their studies in Bangkok to become specialists, he said.

"During that period, the remaining doctors had to work 12-16 hours per day. That left them no time to work in their private clinics and they faced income problems as a result. So by September all of the doctors had resigned," he said.

Having doctors work on a loan basis from other facilities is unsustainable and not a long-term solution to the staffing problem, he added.

"I was told Patong Hospital will have to wait until new doctors can be assigned in the future, just like every other state run hospital in Thailand," he said.

Dr Taveesak, who has worked at the hospital for 15 years, had also tendered his resignation. However, his request was turned down by MoPH permanent secretary Dr Prat Boonyawongvirot during a visit to Phuket in early October.

At that time, Dr Prat also accepted for consideration a proposal to upgrade Patong Hospital from 60 beds to 200 beds in order to provide better service to both Thais and foreigners.

"We presented our plan and an 870-million-baht budget request to develop the hospital and construct a new seven-storey building, but the plan is still under consideration and awaiting cabinet approval. I don't know when it will be approved," he said.

When asked whether the hospital would have a sufficient number of doctors on staff to treat patients after such an upgrade took place, Dr Taweesak said it is the government's duty to address staffing issues.

Phuket Provincial Health Office Director Dr Paisan Worrasathit said government hospitals across the country are facing severe doctor shortages and the MoPH is working hard to solve the problem.

"Government hospitals in Ranong, Phang Nga and Krabi all face shortages, but rather than making an outcry through the media they endure and do their best to treat people and improve their health," he said.

The earliest that new doctors can be assigned will be in the middle of next year, at which time the MoPH will conduct its next "doctors' reshuffle," he explained.

When asked about rumors that the staff walkout at the hospital was in fact due to internal management problems, Dr Paisarn refused to comment, except to say that management practices always have to be examined when staff walkouts occur.


"All I can say is that we are doing our best to develop and improve services at Patong Hospital," he said.







Phuket to host AFF Suzuki Cup



Phuket's Sarakul Stadium will be the host venue of the AFF Suzuki Cup 2008.

PHUKET: Phuket has been announced as the new Thai venue for Group B of the AFF Suzuki Cup. It is the biggest football tournament in South East Asia and the only regional football competition to feature the senior teams of the ASEAN nations.

When contacted by the Phuket Gazette, a spokesperson for the Football Association of Thailand (FAT), who gave his name as Mr Chaiyos, confirmed that Phuket will stage matches at the 30,000 capacity Sarakul stadium in Phuket Town. Games will be played on Dec 6, 8 and 10, Mr Chaiyos added.

Originally slated to take place in Bangkok, the FAT decided that Phuket is the best alternative venue to host one group of this year's tournament, due to the ongoing unrest and disruptions to air travel in Bangkok.

"There's too much trouble in Bangkok, so we've decided to switch the venue," Thai FA chief Worawi Makudi said.

"All parties have agreed this is the best solution to the problem and Phuket is a very suitable alternative because it is not affected by the political situation and Malaysia, Vietnam and Laos can all fly directly to Phuket International Airport," he added.

A total of eight teams will compete for the AFF Suzuki Cup trophy and the US\$100,000 in prize money. The top six seeded ASEAN nations. Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam, will be joined by qualifiers Laos and Cambodia to make up the final field of eight nations.

The competition, formerly known as the Tiger Cup and ASEAN Football Championship, consists of the two group stages followed by semi-finals and finals that will be contested over two legs on a home and away

Phuket will be playing host to Group B, which consists of Thailand, Malaysia, Vietnam and Laos. Group A, which will be based in Jakarta, contains Indonesia, Singapore, Myanmar and Cambodia. The top two teams from each group will go on to the semi-finals.

The venue will be the 15,000-capacity Sarakul Stadium in Phuket Town, which was used for the Fifa Women's Under-19 Championship and has been approved by Fifa. Mr Worawi said he that the stadium, facilities and hotels in Phuket were satisfactory and that Phuket could cope with hosting the biennial tournament.

20-year-old girls killed in double homicide

KOH KAEW: Police have issued an arrest warrant for a man who allegedly shot at three women on a motorbike, killing two of them.

At about 2 am on November 28, Phuket City Police were notified that two women had been found murdered at the mouth of the access road to Laem Hin in Koh Kaew Village 7, Muang Dis-

Police officers, including Phuket Provincial Police Commander Apirak Hongtong, rushed to the scene with Kusoldharm Foundation workers.

At the scene they found the body of one young lady lying in the middle of the road with a Phuket registered motorcycle on top of her. Nearby, the body of another young woman was found in a roadside drainage ditch. Both had been killed instantly from gunshot wounds to the head, fired from a 9mm weapon.

The first victim was identified as 20-year-old Praphasri Limpanon, a resident of Tambon Srisoonthorn Village 5. The other victim was later identified as Khansina Sanhaad, a 20-year-old resident of Pa Khlok.

A third woman who survived the attack said all three women were riding on a single motorbike on Thepkrasattri Rd southbound when a man on another motorbike began chasing them. They turned onto the road to Laem Hin in an attempt to escape, but the man overtook them and cut them off, forcing them to

Once they had stopped, he pulled out a pistol and shot Miss Praphasri, then Miss Khansina. The third woman, whose name was not reported, ran for her life and managed to escape as her assailant got back on his motorbike and sped off.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Apirak Hongtong told the Gazette that an arrest warrant has already been issued for the prime suspect, a former lover of Miss Praphasri.

The two homicides raise to ten the number of shooting murders in Phuket over the past three months.

Dead dugong thought victim of fishing gear

LAEM PANWA: More bad news for Phuket's tiny dugong population came early on the morning of December 2, when the carcass of an immature female was found floating less than a kilometer offshore from Laem Ka, up the coast from the Sea Gypsy Village in Rawai.

Dugong researcher Kanjana Adulyanukosol from the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC) said the carcass was recovered at about 6 am by local fisherman Boonlert Sukasem, who brought the carcass to Chalong Pier and notified local conservationist Sutha Prateep na Thalang, who in turn notified the PMBC.

The fact that it was still floating indicates it had died no more than about 24 hours before its discovery, Ms Kanjana said.

At 167 kilograms and 191 centimeters long, the animal was an immature female about five years old. Dugong reach maturity at about 10 years of age, she

As for the cause of death, the animal had signs of bleeding abrasions on the head and right side of the body. These were recent but minor injuries, not enough to have been the cause of death on their own.

A necropsy performed later that afternoon indicated that the dugong had been feeding well,



with a wide variety of seagrasses in both its large and small intestines, she said.

PMBC veterinarian Songtaya Manawattana said a clot of pus was found in the mammal's windpipe and that it had water in its lungs, indicating that the animal suddenly went into shock and drowned.

Although the exact cause cannot be confirmed, Dr Songtava said the most likely cause of the sudden death was that the animal became ensnared in fishing gear and was unable to get to the surface to breath.

It is not easy for dugong to drown and there is a lot of abandoned fishing gear in the area where the dugong was found, he said.

He added that the population of dugong in Phuket waters is estimated at only about 10 individuals, so the death represents a significant loss in the total population.







Phuket hotels braced for airport fallout

As the siege of Suvarnabhumi entered its second week, Phuket's tourist industry was showing signs of serious strain, with many hotels reporting a significant drop in both current occupancy rates and forward bookings. To gauge the current feeling within the island's hospitality industry, the Phuket Gazette recently talked to senior managers of four leading hotels: the Indigo Pearl, the Evason Phuket & Six Senses Spa, the Holiday Inn Phuket and the Mövenpick Resort. We asked them how they were managing in the face of the growing crisis, and what measures they were implementing to mitigate the effects of the PAD's occupation of Suvarnabhumi and Don Muang airports. Tipwarintron Tanaakarachod reports.

hree out of the four executives interviewed reported that occupancy rates, already under pressure due to the global economic crisis, had seen a visible fall-off since the beginning of the crisis.

Hansruedi Frutiger, GM of the Mövenpick, cited a 4% drop in occupancy, while Frank Grassmann, GM of the Evason, and Matthias Jaeckel, Executive Assistant Manager of the Holiday Inn, also confirmed that they had significantly more empty rooms than this time last year.

By contrast, Indigo Pearl GM Arnaud Girodon told the *Gazette* that his resort remained fully booked, as many customers who were unable to get flights to Bangkok had opted to take ad-

vantage of special rates and stay on at the resort.

Indigo Pearl's close proximity to Phuket's airport was a key factor, he added.

All four hotels have already witnessed a significant reduction in bookings into January and February, with travel trade and MICE business being particularly affected in the short term. Frutiger reported that cancellations were outnumbering reservations by a ratio of 3:2.

Each of the hotels was actively exploring a variety of options to combat the downturn in business and to navigate through the crisis following the closures of the two airports in Bangkok.

"Our customers want to know what is going on, so we are posting regular updates on a flip-

chart in the lobby," said the Holiday Inn's Jaeckel.

To offset falling occupancy rates, the Evason has introduced special "bonus night" packages, where customers who book two nights will receive an additional night free.

Finding a silver lining to the cloud hovering over the industry, Grassmann noted that the recent economic downturn had already forced hotel operators to tighten their belts with cost cutting measures and efficiency programs, leaving them well prepared to weather this latest storm.

Despite the difficulties being encountered by the hotel industry, though, none of the managers interviewed were contem-







plating staff lay-offs.

"Laying off staff is the last thing I would ever do in a crisis," said Frutiger, adding that he would pursue other avenues, such as energy saving and staff up-selling.

Similarly, Grassmann dismissed the idea of cut-backs in the workforce, adding that staff were the "bread and butter" of the business.

Jaeckel said that the Holiday Inn was not considering redundancies and would look at other options, such as variable opening hours for the hotel's outlets as well as shorter staff working hours, before turning to what Indigo Pearl's Girodon termed "the last resort".

The hoteliers remained generally supportive of the TAT, agreeing that the organization was doing everything humanly possible under very difficult circumstances.

Grassmann said the Evason was currently working closely with the TAT on a number of initiatives, while Frutiger expressed the hope that the TAT would continue to campaign aggressively on the industry's behalf with further overseas promotions.

Although markedly downbeat with their short-term projections, the managers remained guardedly optimistic when quizzed about the longer-term prospects for the island's hotels.

Indigo Pearl's Girodon, while sounding words of caution in acknowledging that the next six months would be difficult, went on to point out that Phuket's tourist industry had a long history of resilience in the wake of adversity and would bounce back quickly once the situation had returned to normal.

Frutiger concurred, adding that if the industry could continue

to demonstrate creativity in its pricing and promotions, it would surely recover.

And as crises went, was this the worst the executives had ever seen?

Far from it. With 20 years experience in the hotel business, both Grassmann and Jaeckel said that they had been through a lot

Jaeckel noted that the fallout from the events of September 11 had had a far greater impact on travel and tourism.

For his part, Girodon said that during his 15 years in the business he had seen more than his share of turmoil, including wars in Beirut and Iraq.

"And then, when I arrived in Thailand, they had a coup!" he added with Gallic humor.

A case, perhaps, of Plus ça change... plus c'est la même chose.





Lions Club beach cleanup bags 625 kilos of rubbish



PATONG: Last month saw the Lions Club of Phuket team up with students from four local schools and volunteer divers from All 4 Diving, Sea World Dive Team, Scandinavian Divers and Mermaid Liveaboards for Patong Beach Clean Up Day 2008. After a morning's work, the volunteers managed to remove a total of 625kg of waste from Patong's formerly pristine waters and beach.

Students from Wat Suwan Kiriwong School, Sai Nam Yen School, Ketho School and Kalim School took part in the event, which was organized by the Phuket Lions Club. Additional help came from the local tourist police, who sponsored the event and provided boats and equipment.

A draw was held and the students and divers were split into five colored teams – blue, red, green, yellow and light blue – to introduce a competitive edge to the proceedings. Work began early, while the beach was still relatively deserted, and continued until lunchtime.

While the students spent their time picking up every piece of garbage they could find on the beach, divers took longtail boats out into Patong Bay near Paradise Beach, where they knew there would be waste on the sea bed. Nets and line discarded by fishermen were the most common items found in the water. Other objects collected included hula hoops, a tyre weighing 65kg, a fishing rod, a 33kg anchor and a large plastic scaffolding-like object that weighed 30-40kg.

Phuket Governor Preecha Ruangjan came to inspect the waste collected, accompanied by Lions Club President Claude de Crissey and Kathu Police Chief Krissak. Mr Preecha gave a thank you speech at the closing ceremony, and the Lions Club presented scholarships

Special krathongs sold with added

BANGKOK: In the run up to Loi Krathong festival every year, there are a host of predictable stories in the Thai press about teens who choose to lose their virginity during the romantic, full moon celebration.

Other common reports involve rampant price gouging on candles and other materials needed to make krathongs as the special day draws near.

This year, another seasonal vice was brought to light when a young couple was found to be selling a "special krathong". What made the baskets so special was not their ornate decoration or quality craftsmanship, but the fact that they were stuffed full of ganja.

Police held a press conference on November 13 to announce the arrest of 22-year-old Anucha "Pong" Chompheung and his girlfriend Sungrachani "Nan" Chaiset, 21.

In front of reporters, Mr Anucha admitted that the previous evening he had set up a stall selling krathong for people to float down Khlong Saen Saep, a narrow canal running though the heart of the capital that is probably Thailand's dirtiest waterway.

"Yesterday [November 12], which was Loi Krathong, I wanted to get rid of the last of the ganja that I had, so I decided to try a new marketing method.

"I hid bags of ganja in krathongs, then set up a stall by the side of the canal and sold them for 200 baht each. My customers quickly found out what was happening and came to order 'special krathongs'," Mr Anucha said.

Unfortunately for Mr Anucha and his girlfriend, his customers were not the only ones to get word of the scheme. Phayathai police also heard about the new method of drug dealing.

Later that night, police came to the couple's home in Makkasan district with a search warrant. In the house, they found 133 baggies of ganja with a combined weight of 930 grams and

56 methamphetamine pills.

Under questioning, Mr Anucha said that he had previously worked parking cars at an underground casino. After the casino was shut down, he lost his job and didn't have any money to look after his wife and Miss Sungrachani's three-year-old son.

Then a friend in Bangkok's Klong Toey said that he could sell him ganja in bulk for just 14,000 baht a kilogram, so he decided to buy some and then sell small bags of it to local youths for 200 baht each, making a profit of 2,000-3,000 baht on each lot.

As for his girlfriend, she would order ya bah from another contact for 180 baht a pill and sell it on for 250 baht a pill. All the money went on living expenses and looking after their son, Mr Anucha told police. The cops charged him with possession of cannabis with intent to sell and Miss Sungrachan with the more serious charge of possession of ya bah with intent to sell.

Going for a

PHUKET: A bird singing competition, featuring over a thousand Red-whiskered Bulbuls, was held at Saphan Hin on November 22-23.

The competition was divided into four categories, in which no less than four committees of top bird-song experts assessed the beauty and frequency of the Bulbuls' singing efforts. Prizes were also up for grabs in the "speedy singing" competition, which judged the Bulbuls' capacity to get through as many songs as possible within a 30-minute period.

By far the toughest category, however, was the grueling "singing marathon", in which the melodious contestants were required to sing for as long as possible before, presumably, dropping dead or running out of material.



Giving the lie to the phrase "going for a song", the winners in each of the competitions earned their proud owners lucrative prizes, worth up to 20,000 baht. In all, 360 birds were entered in the beautiful singing competition, with 500 contesting the speedy singing contest and 800 in the singing marathon.

For those of an ornithological bent, the Red-whiskered Bulbul has a tall pointed black crest, red face patch and thin black moustachial line. The loud and evocative call is a sharp kinka-joo, and the song is a scolding chatter. It is more often heard than seen, calling from the tops of trees. Its life span is more than



Flood toll rises in South Two students perish

ith most of the nation's attention focused on events in the capital, 14 people were killed and some 15,000 others treated for various ailments as a result of flooding in the South, Public Health Minister Chalerm Yoobamrung said on November 29.

From November 9 to 28, mobile medical units had treated 15,000 patients, mostly for foot problems and rashes, as well as flu. Some 1,000 others received treatment for stress and insomnia.

The ministry, which has spent 5 million baht to assist the victims, has also sent 50,000 firstaid kits.

The Internal Security Operations Command (ISOC) Region 4 provided food, manpower, vehicles and barges to assist flood victims in the southern border

provinces, including Narathiwat, where five districts were submerged.

Severe flooding killed 14 people who drowned in Nakhon Sri Thammarat. The inundation also destroyed some 315,000 rai of crops, killed nearly 76,000 livestock animals and damaged 1,840 roads, bridges and weirs.

Damage is initially estimated at about 350 million baht, said Nakhon Sri Thammarat Governor Panu Uthairat. Further south, the Pattani River overflowed and flooded homes. The districts of Yaring, Panare, Muang, Mai Kaen and Ma-Yor have been declared disaster zones. In neighboring Yala province, local officials in Betong district were advised to be alert for flooding and landslides round the clock after days of heavy rain.

Politician shot dead

SURAT THANI: A member of the Traisopha Tambon Administration Organization in Surat Thani's Phra Saeng District was shot dead on November 28.

The victim's father was also seriously injured in the attack.

Suthep Khithong, aged 43, was found dead in his pick up truck in Trisopha Village 2. His injured father, Yeuang Khithong, age 63, was in the passenger seat next to him.

Police say both had been shot multiple times. Mr Yueang was taken to Surat Thani Hospital, where he was reported to be in serious condition.

Southern conflict continues

YALA: A rubber tapper was found shot dead in his orchard early on the morning of December 1 in Yala's Thantoe district, one of the most highly contested areas in the Deep South.

Police said the body of Adinan Che-sameh, 27, was riddled with bullets. The attack is the latest in ongoing violence in the Muslim majority region, where more than 3,200 people – mostly Malay Muslims – have been killed since January 2004 in connection with the ongoing insurgency.

The government blamed most, if not all, of the violent attacks in the region on a new generation of Malay separatists bent on carving out a separate homeland for Malay Muslims in the region.

Local Malay Muslims, on the other hand, accuse the authorities of carrying out a number of abductions, target killings and other atroci-

In other incidents of violence in the Deep South, three people were shot dead and a teacher was seriously wounded.

On the same morning as the three killings, gunman riding pillion on a motorbike shot Prasarn Chairaj, 49, a teacher in Pattani's Nong Chick District. Mr Prasarn survived the attempt on his life, but was last reported in critical condition.

Police are continuing their investigations into the violence.



in bus tire blowout

HAAD YAI: Two female students were killed in a freak accident in Haad Yai on November 26 when two tires of the bus they were traveling in burst, blowing a hole in the wooden floor of the vehicle.

Saowanee Jansawang and Kusuma Paethiow, both 21-yearold accounting students at Rajamangala University of Technology's Srivijaya Campus, fell under the bus when the floor beneath them was blown out by a pair of exploding tires on the left-hand rear of the bus.

Police said that the bodies of the two young women were found about 200 meters behind the bus, which came to a stop by the side of Kanchanawanit Rd in Tambon Nam Noi, on the road from Haad Yai to Songkhla Town. The two tires were completely shredded and there was a large hole above the axle where the seat had fallen through.

Other passengers said that the bus had been traveling fast downhill when the tires suddenly exploded, sending large fragments of the wooden floor flying into the bus. Three other students from the same university were injured. Passengers reported watching in horror as Miss Saowanee and Miss Kusuma fell onto the road under the bus.

Police detained bus driver Khren Samnuan, 43, to establish if there were any grounds to charge him over the incident.

SURAT THANI: A 72-year-old man stabbed his wife to death, then attempted to kill himself in Surat Thani's Kanchanadit District on November 25.

After hearing the elderly couple arguing, a neighbor who came to investigate found Chuan Kangbol lying on the floor and foaming at the mouth next to the body of his wife, Rachinee Kangbol, 73.

The neighbor called the police and took Mr Chuan to Kanchanadit Hospital. He was later transferred to Surat Thani Hospital for further treatment.

Police said that they believe Mr Chuan stabbed Mrs Rachinee after they had had an argument, and that he then drank insecticide to kill himself.





Construction, con artists and other shenanigans

eaching skyward: Ao Nang residents have been perplexed at how a beachfront building has been able to add to the height of their building, above all the other buildings, in excess of the six-meter limit within 50 meters of the beach. Seeing this, all of the other beachfront property owners immediately became curious to see if the height regulations had been relaxed, or if this was just another example of construction without a proper permit.

While there had been talk of relaxing height restrictions in areas more than 300 meters from the beach, no-one has been aware of a change in the beachfront limits. The construction had carried on for quite some time and looked near to completion when a large sign suddenly appeared on the front of the building. It was a sign from the Ao Nang Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*) ordering a halt in construction. The next question locals asked was: "Why did they take so long?"

This is the most visible, high traffic area in Ao Nang. It would be impossible not to notice the construction, even for the most casual observer. The latest word is the building must be knocked back down to the legal height. Good to see.

If you have been reading my columns over the past few months, you have been following the stories of various "Nigerian scam" emails that have been hitting resorts and hotels.

In addition, I highlighted the emails to "Update your account information" from various vendors from e-Bay to Yahoo, including one that duped one of my business associates.



Of all the scams, this has to be the lowest: I hope they rot in hell.



d ber, Krabi celebrates the ✓ beginning of a new tourist season with the Boek Fa Andaman Festival, which means "Opening the Andaman Sea". After the long rainy season, locals gather in anticipation of the influx of tourists over the coming months.

> A second, smaller stage featured performances from local musicians. Isalee Mala played traditional Thai folk music, known as 'Rong Ngeng', and there were also appearances by Jellyfish Band, featuring Choy, and Thai reggae sensation Job2do.

> Rong Ngeng music is played on violins, mandolins, Arabian drums and Chinese gongs, accompanied by old fashioned Western dances. It is still prominent in Koh Lanta, where the first settlers inherited the legacy from the Portuguese, who had been the first Europeans to trade with

have pity on me. It's not easy writing food reviews when you want to blow the lid off corporate gouging but realize the resulting libel actions and lawyers' fees would put a serious dent in the twiceweekly Moët et Chandon delivery bill. Another hard fact of life for the average Joe restaurant critic is that just before writing a

review for a seriously good restaurant you can get stomach-wrenching munchies that would shame Cheech and Chong after a bong-bashing session – because you're now

going to have to describe a meal that damn well hit the perfect

In the case of Paris Phuket in Kata, the second scenario applies. "Drat", and, as Daffy Duck would say, "triple drat".

But first let's give credit where credit is due: The guy who put me onto the Paris Phuket bistro is none other than "Mr Moo" himself, Ray Vaillancourt, nowadays a purveyor of fine English pork products.

He it was who ran Bluefin, the successful expat Kata hangout, all those years ago, when 80% of the island's population drove like idiots and 15% were hospitalized because of them (RIP the other 5% and nothing's really changed since then, has it?)

So here Ray and I are on a Friday evening, reminiscing about the days when expats were somewhat whimsically known by their first names and their professions only; when "Second-hand Steve", "Computer Dave" and the like were the island's movers and shakers.

Ray, of course, was known as "Bluefin Ray" and hasn't lost an ounce of the charisma that made his bar such a nighttime magnet for the eclectic mixture of beach bums that made up the local expat scene.

This, of course, way before the environmentally challenged sell the island down the river. those carpetbaggers moved in.

omeone out there, please Phuket's young owner-chef from Toulouse, has set up a shop-house restaurant diagonally opposite the Sawasdee Village on Kata's Khetkwan Road. He's a modest sort of guy with a lovely young wife and a bouncy daughter.

His name – like those expats of a few years ago – is apt for someone who serves such angelic wine with his fare. He suggests a Chateau Causse St Chinian.

> which, slightly chilled, bears up well through the evening. Claude, it must be added, does not hold a French monopoly on neat monikers: a few years ago Le Meridien was

managed by a certain Monsieur "Hotelier".

To an extent Kata is the domain of Scandinavian visitors to Phuket, but it's often foolish to generalize and, as if to prove the point, the evening Mr Moo and I were there a savvy Dutch crowd came in to mark their last evening on the island before heading back to the land where you can smoke a reefer but not a Marlboro in a café.

They were obviously familiar with Paris Phuket's charms and rattled off their orders posthaste before I had time to sink a glass of Chinian – and that doesn't normally take long.

No wonder they were enthusiastic: the six-table restaurant (20 covers) is personable and friendly, but most of all, Claude delivers some of the best cuisine I have ever sampled in Phuket.

Don't get me wrong: I'm the last to gush, and the service at PP is somewhat slow. It's just that when the food does arrive it's obvious that Claude has cooked it just for you. Now, how far away can you get from corporate blandness than that?

The foie gras de canard (there's that dratted duck again) with framboise and salad has flavor subtleties that dance between orgasmic and, well, multiple-orgasmic.

Ray and I slip into a semi-"property developers" moved in to torpor between courses and cast our minds back to the Phuket of Phuket, believe me, used to be one yore... Those were the days, hell of a beautiful spot before some 15 years ago, when men were men and women were Claude Angevin, Paris women. Nowadays, who cares?

An impossibly juicy red grouper filet and perfectly crunchy croquette with a yielding interior, accompanied by spanking asparagus, is served up by Pookie, Claude's lovely wife, and it knocks the "remember when my ex assaulted me in your bar" conversation stone dead. It's just perfect, and I can't recommend it highly

Indeed, I suggest you give Claude a phone call ahead of trying this place to find out if he's booked up – a probability, since it's a real find in a tourism-choked minefield of mediocre cuisine.

Next comes a lovely rare hunk of beef with an egg cream and Gruyère morel sauce alongside courgette slivers and potato fritters, which is fiendishly difficult to describe except to say that the whole affair is worth a "dear diary" moment.

Crumbs. For once, I'm lost for words. I'll just say this: if you are looking for dedicated one-onone home-cooked French cuisine then it's got to be Paris Phuket.





Raising the bar in Phuket's fitness clubs

ot content with raising the bar with their own state of the art, space age gym, two men are determined to raise the standard for personal fitness training throughout Phuket. Hayden Rhodes and CJ Prieur, who manage Royal Phuket Marina (RPM) Health Club, have together offered the island of Phuket's first ever course for personal fitness instructors accredited by the American Council on Exercise (ACE).

Personal training is one of the fastest growing professions in the health and fitness industry. ACE's Personal Trainer Certification is designed for fitness trainers providing any form of one-on-one or small-group fitness instruction.

Twelve Thai trainers took the course, of whom only three passed at the first attempt, which is a testament to the depth and breadth of the knowledge required to achieve the internationally recognized ACE certificate.

Of these three, one, Vorapong Sripet, is employed by RPM Health Club; another, Natarujar Sukkharat, works at the Hilton Phuket Arcadia; and the third, Anothai Klomsiri, is at the Amanouri Hotel in Bang Tao.

Originally from Phuket, Vorapong, 29, has been working in the fitness industry for seven

"I like helping people exer-

cise," he says.

"This course has taught me the right way to exercise and I have learned some much more complicated exercises. Now I can just look at a person and judge where they are physically strong and weak and where they might have any problems just from their posture. I couldn't do that before."

The course was no walk in the park though, as Vorapong admits that it was very difficult.

"You don't just learn about exercises, you learn about the whole body and all the muscles. It's not just about running. This course has taught me how to help people to exercise with a specific goal in mind. For instance if you

are a boxer normally you will just get taught how to box but I can show you exercises which will improve specific muscles for boxing," he says.

"I am very happy because not many people can get this qualification. There were more than 10 people on the course and only three got the certificate," he adds.

Natarujar Sukkharat, 30, has been at the Hilton Arcadia for four years. For her, passing the course is an achievement for a different reason. She says she didn't do much exercise in the past and has a lot of friends who work in offices.

"They don't exercise because they say they don't have time and I want to be a role model


for them. Before, people would not have believed that I could do this, because I am very skinny and have never been particularly good at sports," she says.

"This course has completely changed my habits and changed my attitude. I was very nervous at first but now I am happy to talk to the guests and share my knowledge with them. I work in the hospitality business so I want to provide the best possible service for my customers," she adds.

At 43, Anothai Klomsiri is the veteran of the trio. Anothai works at the Amanpuri Hotel in Bang Tao and has done so for the past 13 years.

Hayden has been in the fitness industry for 15 years and is the club manager at RPM Health Club, which opened earlier this



Jazz fit for a king





he island's hipper denizens congregated in Phuket City November 30 for the first of this year's Rommanee Jazz Festival events. The evening saw an eclectic mix of local and visiting musicians entertain the crowds between the charming Sino-Portuguese shophouses of Soi Rommanee, in the heart of Phuket's Old Town.

The event was the first of five that will take place on the last Sunday of each month until April, when the rainy season will begin and dampen Phuket's appetite for outdoor festivals. 

The Scholarship fund has helped hundreds of local students over the years. For 2008, scholarships were given to 240 students at a cost of 2.8 million baht.





orsche has released the first official photos of the Panamera, a full six months before the official launch.

Like all Porsche models, the Panamera is oriented in every respect to the needs of the driver.

Occupants enjoy perfect ergonomic comfort in both the front seats and the two firmly contoured single seats in the rear.

The luggage compartment accommodates a large amount of luggage, while the variable space concept, with its folding rear seat backrests, enables the driver and passengers to individually adjust luggage space to fit their personal requirements.



he current global finan cial crisis is generating interest in investments considered safer than the volatile stock markets. One such option is gold, but, having decided to invest in this most reliable of precious metals, the next question is: how does one hold gold?

Going for gold

Gold can be held in a bank safety deposit box, but many international investors will find it difficult to arrange this less-than-simple transaction. An alternative is an ETF (Exchange Traded Fund) which is simply a unit trust or mutual fund that holds physical gold, ensures security and issues units (shares) to represent the holdings of individual investors

Again, this sounds straightforward, but anti-money laundering safeguards in the US (where many ETFs originate) mean that the average non-American expat investor is probably going to find



the process onerous, since additional checks will be made on investors who are not US citizens. International ETFs are also available, and such investors will find them considerably easier to access.

The problem is that gold, in its physical form, does not yield an income; the investor is reliant on a rise in the price of gold to make a profit.

That said, if an investor believes that recent stimulus and bailout packages will result in a weaker US dollar, then gold will very likely return to its traditional role as a counterbalance to the US unit

Another possible outcome of the massive monetary and fiscal stimulus packages being seen around the world is the return of high levels of inflation. Central

banks and governments may well succeed in their mission to create economic growth, but it may become necessary to mop up excess liquidity or risk high inflation or the creation of yet another asset bubble.

For gold "bulls", an alternative way to invest is to purchase gold shares, which offer significantly higher returns than simply holding the physical metal. Most gold shares represent the metal in the mines themselves.

Normally when the gold price rises, gold shares increase at a much faster pace due to the fixed cost to produce gold. For example, if the total cost of extraction is US \$500 per ounce while the gold price is US\$800 per ounce, then the profit is US\$300. If the price rises to US\$1,100 per ounce then the profit margin has

increased by 100%.

In reality, gold share transactions are not as simple as in the example above. Emotions in broader stockmarkets are one of the main reasons for this. Should a rise in the price of gold coincide with a rising stockmarket, gold shares will generally outperform average shares. However, if the rest of the stockmarket is bearish, returns are likely to be lower. Stockmarkets vary between overly optimistic and overly pessimistic. In an overly pessimistic market, "paper assets", i.e. shares, tend to underperform.

Gold peaked at US\$840 an ounce in the early 1980s. It bottomed out at around US\$250 an ounce in the late 1990s and only reached this peak again early this year.

In fact, gold was at US\$1,017, a new record high, some months ago, only to lose around 30% of its value subsequently. Only recently has it shown signs of life again and moved to over US\$800 an ounce.

It is difficult for private investors to select individual gold shares; much more efficient is an investment in a gold fund held offshore.

It is important, as always, to select a fund manager with an above-average track record.

The final way for the private investor to invest in gold is via the futures markets. Again, it is important to use a fund for this approach.

The volatility of futures funds means they are seldom boring, but they have one great advantage over any other investment method: they can make a profit on both a rising or falling gold price.

We live in very uncertain times and reliable crystal balls are in extremely short supply. However, an investor in gold over the past five years would have seen a gain of around 100%, and a gain over the last 10 of around 300%.

John LeCarré takes on terrorism

n 1957, with the publication of his third novel, "The Spy Who Came in from the Cold", John LeCarré invented a new form of fiction: the literary spy thriller. What differentiates Le Carré's novels from the formulaic plots of lesser writers is the depth of characterization found in his work, as well as his highly accomplished literary style and deep and often conflicting moral concerns.

LeCarré followed the success of his first novel with his famed Smiley Trilogy, centering on George Smiley, the British spy chief who does battle with his Russian counterpart, Karla.

Following the Cold War, LeCarré deftly turned his hand to other centers of conflict that lent themselves to espionage: the international arms trade ("The Night Manager"), war in the eastern Congo ("Mission Song"), the Israeli-Palestinian conflict ("The Little Drummer Girl") and Big Pharma ("The Constant Gardener").

At age 77, he has produced his 21st novel, "A Most Wanted Man". The subject of the title is a stick-thin young man named Issa who has been imprisoned and tortured in Russia for being a Chechen terrorist. He has escaped a Turkish prison aboard a smuggler's vessel and has turned up in Hamburg, Germany, with no papers and his photo distributed by Interpol.

Here he is taken in hand by an idealist young German lawyer named Annabel who is working for an organization that helps the stateless.

He appears to be a devout Muslim who is innocent of the charges against him. He also possesses a deposit box number containing millions, in care of a failing private British bank run by Tommy Brue, the last of a line of family bankers.

It turns out that the money has been deposited by a notorious Russian special forces chief. It turns out too that Issa is the Russian master criminal's son.

All this sparks the interest of Gunther Bachmann, a German intelligence agent, who is on the trail of the money that supports terrorism in the Islamic world.


"If there are people in the world for whom espionage was ever the only possible calling, Bachmann was such a person. The polyglot offspring of mixed marriages contracted by a flam-

boyant German-Ukrainian woman, Bachmann had by the age of thirty run away to sea, trekked the Hindu Kush, been imprisoned in Colombia and written a thousand-page unpublishable novel.

Yet somehow, he has discovered his true calling; first as the occasional overseas official without diplomatic rank; in Warsaw for the Polish; in Aden, Beirut, Baghdad and Mogadishu for his Arabic; and in Berlin for his sins, while he cooled his heels after fathering a near-epic scandal of which only the sketchiest outlines had ever reached the gossip mill."

Bachmann's target isn't Issa but far bigger fry: Dr Abdullah, code-named Signpost, an Egyptian Islamic scholar, author and television personality.

Dr Abdullah collects millions for Islamic charities, perhaps five per cent of which goes to fund terrorists. The Americans, the British and the Germans all want him. Bachmann's idea is to abduct him



briefly and turn him into a double agent. The Anglo-American approach is much more brutal.

The plot is quite linear, without the usual LeCarré flourishes, and ends in a single violent collision. Perhaps all the better, given the suddenly ruined lives of people the reader has come to care deeply about.

Barbara replies: Whoever invented English didn't think it through to this level of detail.

Your sentence is going to be ambiguous one way or another, so you might as well have it be ambiguous in a grammatically orderly way. "Bill and Jim" and "their" are plural, so "wives" should be too.

Furthermore, no one is truly likely to misunderstand "take their wives to dinner." Only someone who is looking for trouble will find

All the same, carefully matching the parts of a sentence can sometimes make it worse. "At the end of the evening, the wives gave each other goodbye kisses" sounds a bit steamy, don't you

If you want to be very precise, you could say, "Each wife gave the other a goodbye kiss." But most people would say, "The wives gave each other a goodbye kiss" - and that's perfectly correct.

People who insist it's not correct and they would never be so sloppy haven't done as much painstaking editing as I have. Constructions of that kind are common – so common that we scarcely notice them unless the misreading is funny.

In fact, the one hard-andfast rule about them - which

Barbara replies: That's a bit harsh about decades' worth of dumbing down the language, don't you think?

There is very little that was correct decades ago that is now considered incorrect.

The major exceptions are references we've come to think of as sexist, racist or ethnocen-

For instance, a nonspecific "policeman" is now a "police officer," and the members of racial, religious and disabled groups etc. get to decide what they should be called. But that change in the language isn't a dumbing down. It's a wising up to people's sensitivi-

On the other hand, it's true that many spellings and phrasings once considered incorrect have become acceptable.

Each of us has to decide where on the spectrum of correctness we feel most comfort-

Lots of people want to be relaxed and modern, as opposed to formal and traditional, and I don't particularly blame them.

Sometimes I like to be relaxed and modern too – but my duty is to explain what's unques-

tionably correct, and traditional usage almost always is.

Which brings us back to your question about "if" and

Try looking under "subjunctives" in your books on English. That's where you're most likely to find these words discussed.

The subjunctive is one of three "moods" of English. The other moods are the indicative, which is what we usually use, and the imperative, which is for commands.

We use the subjunctive mainly for talking about hypothetical things, and we create it with out-of-the-ordinary verb forms such as "I were."

When we "wish" for something, that something is hypothetical, because, of course, we don't have it.

So the subjunctive mood is correct for wishes, as in "I wish I WERE king" – as opposed to an indicative statement like "IAM (or WAS or WILL BE) king in the community-theater play.'

"If" is trickier, because some "if" statements are purely hypothetical, and others are based

"If I WERE king" is again hypothetical, and therefore subjunctive.

Contrast that, please, with the reality-based "If I AM ever going to end this long explanation, I might as well do it now."

The long road to recovery

As this edition of the *Phuket Gazette* goes to press, the first flight from Phuket to Suvarnabhumi was getting ready for take-off after the unprecedented one-week closure of Thailand's primary international airport (and its domestic hub) by anti-government protesters from the People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD).

By most estimates it will take at least two weeks for Suvarnabhumi Airport to return to anything resembling normal service due to operational factors, the mess left behind by the protesters, and the need to re-certify Suvarnabhumi in accordance with internationally recognized International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) standards. That process is expected to take one to two weeks, with officials aiming to have it certified and fully operational by December 15, at the earliest.

The number of stranded tourists had surpassed 350,000 by the time the PAD finally called off its protest in the wake of the Constitutional Court decision to dissolve the three main coalition parties for electoral fraud – a ruling that most certainly would have been made without the PAD's illegal and devastating occupation of Bangkok's airports, it should be noted.

The number of stranded holiday-makers will certainly continue to swell as more people end their vacations and find they have no way of getting home. Each of those inconvenienced will have his or her own tale of woe to recount to friends in their home country, which is certain to cause long-term damage to Thailand's already tainted reputation as a tourist destination.

While it is probably too early to speculate on what the longterm effects on Phuket's tourism industry will be, most industry analysts concede that this year's high season, which was off to a poor start anyway, is now almost a complete write-off.

Despite all the bad news, the fact remains that the worst of this crisis will soon be behind us and the likelihood of mass bloodshed in the streets of the capital has receded.

Fortunately, Phuket has shown remarkable resiliency over the years, most notably after the 2004 tsunami disaster that wiped out a high season but saw arrival figures rebound and reach new highs in 2007.

Unfortunately, over the same period, the number of rooms in accommodation establishments registered with the Tourism Authority of Thailand also increased at an unsustainable rate: from 32,076 units in 2005 to 38,582 in 2008, an increase of over 20%.

If there is a silver lining to be found in the recent events, it might be a long-overdue slowdown in this growth rate, which has led to environmental degradation, infrastructural woes and a host of other problems which have significantly degraded the island's once-indisputable charms.



Years of Living Dangerously

t's been over 23 years since I left my native homeland to set out on a journey that has circumnavigated the globe more times than I can recall and which has led me to my home here in Southeast Asia.

I started out, full of wanderlust and looking to live overseas in exotic places, knowing not a single soul in the distant lands to which I was headed. Growing up in the faceless suburbs of a large West Coast city in the US, names like Bali, Tahiti, Nepal and Thailand captivated my imagination and prompted those first faltering steps that were later to become a way of life. Like many, it was this quixotic quest for a "life less ordinary" that ultimately landed me here in Phuket.

Not since the political upheavals of the 1950s and 1960s has the world been gripped by such uncertainty.

Terrorism, financial turmoil and political crises now fill the headlines on a daily basis. Coming, as I do, from a country with over 200 years of on-the-job training in the democratic process, I have to say that we are still finding our way, and where every step forward is so often accompanied by two steps back. Thailand has had but a fraction of this time to find its legs in the pursuit of self determination and democ-

As these institutions are now being targeted by those looking to inflict immeasurable harm, it would be all too easy to avoid them and to look for alternatives. But how much would we forsake if we were simply to opt to stay at home and never venture beyond the sanctuary of our own beds and out into the unknown.

It is true that we live in dangerous times, but the question of personal safety remains full of contradictions. Statistically speaking, traveling around Asia still poses less of a threat to your health than watching too much TV or crossing the road. While gen-

erations have tried and failed to solve the world's problems, the reality is that life is, by its very nature, risky and unsure.

All we can do is live life to the full, take whatever chances come our way, while all the while marveling at the wonder and excitement of the ever-changing world around us.

Life is a journey, and as with any journey there are bound to be a few bumps in the road along the way.

Getting tooled up for DIY: Part two

In this second column we will complete our look at basic handtools.

Hex-keys, also known as Allen wrenches or Allen keys, are hexagonal 'L'-shaped pieces of metal designed to screw in bolts with hexagonal holes stamped into the head. There are three types of set available: a plastic set, a pouch-type set mounted on a 'key-ring', and a set assembled into a pocket-knife-type tool. The pocket-knife type is the handiest, containing about six of the most common sizes.

Since each wrench can either be opened straight out or at a 90-degree angle, they are more versatile. A word of caution; when using the smaller wrenches opened at 90-degrees to the handle, be careful not to overtighten, as it is easy to strip small bolt-heads, causing a whole new problem. You might also round off the end of the wrench, and must then grind off this portion, an extra chore you really didn't need.

The sets in plastic pouches usually include the larger sizes,

good for automotive work. The key-ring sets, with small springs wrapped around the shafts, seem to be made of the cheapest steel, and while handy (since they can be taken off the key-ring and used in tight places), they are best suited to small bolts that don't require lots of torque. Get one of each type of socket set and before use, put a drop of motor oil beneath the Mercedes-logoshaped knob or small lever on the ratchet-head.

The brands where the shaft swells gradually from the handle to the ratchet-head are much stronger than those that go right from a straight shaft to the rounded head of the ratchet-gear mechanism. The first time one of these weaker ones snaps and cracks one of your knuckles, you will definitely wish you'd had a stronger tool. Most hex keys sold here are made in China, Taiwan or Indonesia, and frankly, the metal is cheap. Don't over-torque with them, or they will break.

Nut-drivers are essentially sockets on shafts with screw-

driver-type handles. They come either as plastic-pouch-type sets or in a hard-plastic box like the socket sets. The pouch type is easier to fit in the toolbox.

Adjustable wrenches, also known as crescent wrenches, are handy on nuts for which you lack the proper size regular wrench. Apply oil to each side of the adjustment screw where it mounts in the head and keep a thin film of grease on the "teeth" of the underside of the sliding jaw. This will ensure it is easy to turn. If you use the tool often, grease it regularly, as using it will cause the

grease to come off on your fingers. When using the wrench, try to hold the jaws against the nut with one hand and tighten with the other, wiggling the handle just slightly back and forth until the jaws are secure. This will fully tighten the jaws, take up slack in the screw and prevent the jaws opening and rounding off the edges of the nut. Remember to keep thumb pressure on the adjustment screw while using one of these.

Saws. Since most saws are too big for a toolbox, find a space where they can be kept close by, or hung on a wall-mounted board (one of our upcoming projects). Hacksaws are the type with a rectangular metal frame and a changeable blade attached to the front of the handle and the front of the frame. The blades here are the key. The higher the "number" of the blade, the more teeth per inch. Get a few "12s" or "14s" for wood, a few "18s" for PVC, and "22s" or "24s" for metal. As with all saws, don't use too much force when cutting and let the

blade's teeth do the work. Pressing too hard will cause the blade to twist, resulting in a crooked cut. It can also crack and cause breakage. Get a wood saw as well, the type with a solid wooden handle, as the plastic-handled ones break easily. After each use, wipe the blade with an oily rag, as rust can cause the blade to drag on the sides of a cut and require more exertion.

Here are some other useful items to round off your basic hand-tool collection:

Files. Files come in flat, halfround and rat-tail (cylindrical) shapes and are good for shaping metal and rounding sharp edges


Chisels. "Cold chisels" are used for metal and (when used with a hammer) are handy for separating rusted parts. "Punches" are small, pointed chisels, good for making a starting dimple when drilling metal. "Wood chisels" have screwdriver-type handles, come in various sizes, and are handy for installing door hardware.

C-clamps. C-clamps are useful for holding things together while being repaired with glue, or holding things being drilled.





Don't look now, but we're getting better

t's the night before Phuket's first Barcamp, and I'm putting the finishing touches on my presentation about Internet access speeds in Phuket. I've been giving these presentations to various groups around the island for several years now, and they're invariably depressing: speeds occasionally show some signs of improvement, but more often than not the changes are minimal, and sometimes illusory. Last year about this time, I was trying to explain to people why their Internet speeds had been cut in half, overnight.

I started going over the data we've been accumulating, with thousands of Internet speed tests being run all over the island. When I ran a comparison of speeds for the most popular packages from January to November of this year – the graph you can see on this page - my jaw dropped.

Hey, it's hip and cool to complain about Internet speeds, right? Kinda like the weather, or the air pollution in Bangkok. I, for one, have to stop kvetching (complaining). The numbers that are popping up now rate as downright astounding – not as good as Hong Kong or Korea or Singapore, to be sure, but they've improved enormously this year. Believe it or not, somebody, some-

where, is doing something right. First, the details. The graph shows international download speeds

from Phuket, as posted on the Phuket Internet Speed Site at liveaccess.com/ PhuketInternet.aspx. (Thanks to Henry Habermacher and X-Net for building and maintaining the site.) I talked about the site in my September 27 column, which is available on the *Phuket Gazette* web site at tinyurl.com/5m5hk2. The numbers you see are from uniform speed tests, all performed the same way, with a high speed server located in San Francisco. The tests are conducted all over the island, using more than a dozen different Internet packages from TOT, TT&T, CAT, iPSTAR, AIS, DTAC, and others. They're reported by ordinary people like you and me, based on test results over the Internet connections we use every day. I've combined several of the package results to make the graph more legible.

Starting at the bottom, the CAT EV-DO service (you may know it as the "Air Card"; see tinyurl.com/6plk2c) is the only fast wireless Internet available in Phuket, and it's only available from CAT. The technology hasn't changed much this year, although CAT now sells "Rev A" hardware, instead of the older "Rev 0." While some people report that their EV-DO speeds have gone down, the numbers show that, on average, international access speeds in November were 50% higher than they were in January. Since the number of EV-DO cards being used now is considerably greater than the number ten months ago, I have to conclude that CAT is successfully improving its network's responsiveness, at least as measured by international access speeds.


TOT speeds have improved considerably, as well. The TOT speed numbers include all of the TOT services, regardless of price. At the beginning of the year, TOT only offered two ADSL packages. Now there are a halfdozen. People currently running the most expensive TOT package, rated at 4 Mbps (more or less 4,000 Kbps), report wide swings in speeds.

I tracked two different TT&T packages. At the beginning of the year, TT&T offered

just one package, MaxNet, and it performed even worse than TOT. Starting in April, TT&T finally decided to compete, and the result has been startling.

Our first reports of TT&T MaxNet Premier times appeared in July. (Starting in July, the TT&T MaxNet number on the graph includes TT&T MaxNet Indy, which is slower than TT&T MaxNet Premiere.) TT&T MaxNet Premiere times sunk in October, but have started coming back up.

If you're shopping around for a new Internet connection, the



International Internet speeds in Phuket really are getting better. Depending on which package you use and how much you pay, your speeds now should be 50% to 300% faster than at the beginning of the year.

and Chalong – and they consistently turn out 2,500 to 2,600 Kbps. The same service in Kata runs considerably slower.

The CAT HiNet graph shows steady improvement from January to April, and then shoots way up in October. That was the month when CAT started offering free upgrades from HiNet 2 Mbps to 4 Mbps, for any customer who had their line more than six months. (See tinyurl.com/ 6e3zuw for details.)

As things stand, if you're looking for a new Internet connection, TT&T MaxNet Premier runs faster than CAT HiNet, simply because CAT isn't automatically upgrading customers to their 4 Mbps service. At least, they aren't yet.

What's happening?

Clearly, both CAT and TT&T are making sincere efforts to increase the size of the data pipes from Phuket to the internet back-

I've never been able to get Phuket-based numbers or statistics from either company, but Thailand's National Electronics and Computer Technology Center (NECTEC) publishes composite statistics for all of Thailand. per second).

By November, that number was up to 45.8 Gbps – a 97% increase in ten months.

International bandwidth will more than double this year. It doubled in 2007. But it only went up 25% in 2006.

CAT once had a monopoly on international internet connections, but that changed in 2006. Right now, CAT, TOT, TT&T, True, CS Loxinfo and ADC all have international gateways connecting Thailand to the Internet backbone. (ADC is a joint venture between TOT and AIS. Thaksin Shinawatra sold AIS to the Singapore government's Temasek Holdings in 2006.)



The sixth annual Phuket 7s tournament went ahead as planned over the weekend of December 29-30, despite airport closures in Bangkok, which caused 14 teams to withdraw and forced the organizers to rearrange the fixture list at the last minute.

For Josh Schirmer, who scored the "golden goal" winner in extra time to win the Open Cup for Tokyo Hibernian, it was a fairytale ending to a nightmare journey.

Josh's ordeal began when, having arrived in Singapore from Tokyo, he was told that his connecting flight to Phuket had been canceled.

Determined to participate in the tournament, which he had won with Tokyo Hibernian for the previous two years, Josh set out on a marathon 24-hour bus journey from Singapore to Phuket.

He arrived on the island in time to compete in Sunday's fixtures, helping Tokyo Hibernian to reach the final of the Men's Open where they faced China-based German opposition in the form of the Shanghai Krauts.

With the final deadlocked at 1-1 at the end of regulation time, the match went into a five-minute sudden-death play-off, with the first team to score a "golden goal" declared the winner.

With a penalty shoot out looming, Josh collected the ball inside the opposition half and fired an unstoppable shot through a crowd of players, past the unsighted keeper, and into the roof of the net.

This was the third consecutive year Tokyo Hibernian had

won the Men's Open, and for Josh, it made the whole trip worthwhile, "We've won it the last two years and having traveled for so long to get here, I really wanted to win."

The Open Cup was not the only competition to go to the wire. The Masters Cup, for veteran players, was contested between Team Bondi, from Australia, and Tokyo-based side, Footy Japan.

Team Bondi looked on course for a third consecutive victory in the cup when they took a deserved 1-0 lead.

However Footy Japan battled back to level the game at one apiece and snatched a lastminute winner with the final kick of the game, a coolly taken penalty, giving Footy Japan a dramatic 2-1 victory.

For tournament organizer Tim Hodgson the airport closure was a major headache.

"We lost 14 teams as a result of the closures and it was a nightmare for me having to completely rearrange all the fixtures. In the end we had 22 teams who were able to compete and I think everyone had a good time," he said.

"We will be organizing another three tournaments next year in Phuket and another one in Bangkok," he added.

Design The Chedi

Green getaway in gorgeous Pansea Bay

he thatched cottages that comprise the luxurious Chedi Phuket resort dot the shore of Pansea Bay, sheltering under coconut palms on landscaped slopes that gently descend to one of the island's most beautiful sections of coastline.

The five-star resort is as tastefully designed as you might expect for one of the island's most plush getaways, with a rustic aesthetic that is reflected throughout the complex.

But what distinguishes The Chedi Phuket from its peers is the amount of thought that has been put into environmental management, both in the resort's design and in the way it operates.

Great care has been taken to ensure that the resort's impact on the environment is minimized, a conscious effort to appeal to the well-heeled traveler with a green conscience.

Buildings have been designed to promote natural air flow, reducing the need for air conditioning. Where possible, natural or recycled products have been used throughout the complex. For example, roofing is thatched, all paper is recycled and cloth bags and weaved products are used instead of plastic.

Orchids and other live flowers adorn the rooms, ensuring the natural ethos is reflected aesthetically as well as in practice. Local plants and trees such as Frangipani, Wedelia, coconut and banana line the footpaths, and no alien flora have been planted anywhere within the grounds.

Care is also taken to minimize the resort's carbon footprint: energy-saving lightbulbs are fitted throughout and local herbal drinks are served to guests, pro-

moting Phuket's unique natural produce while reducing transportation emissions associated with importing products from outside the locale. The resort also supports tree planting in urban areas, helping to offset the resort's own environmental impact.

The resort is fitted with grease traps and recycles its

waste water, with much of it used to nourish the plants on site. So-dium Chloride (salt) is used in the swimming pool, meaning there is no need to add chlorine to the water. The hotel always examines the quality of water before it disposes of it into the sea or canals, according to the law.

Garbage is sorted and much

of it is then sold to be re-used by local businesses, bringing money in which is used to finance an annual staff party. The Chedi Phuket also supports educational institutions by allowing hospitality students to observe the hotel in operation.

With such an impressive list of measures in place, it's clear

the developers have put a lot of effort into differentiating the resort from its peers. It might be churlish to point out that such features do not come cheap, but The Chedi Phuket will surely be high on the list of desirable stays for any traveler of means looking for a tranquil getaway and environmental piece of mind.

Mixed residential development under construction in Chalong

Construction has begun on The Clover Phuket, a new residential development on more than two rai located off Kwang Road in Chalong.

The developer, Living Land Capital, said that work on the 79-unit project commenced on November 15, and should be completed by November 2009.

Construction of the project is expected to cost around 200-million-baht.

The first unit owners will be moving in the following December.

As well as 79 condominium units, the seven-storey "modern tropical" development will feature four "Town Home" units and two "Home Office" units. Facilities will include a swimming pool, fitness centre, multi-purpose room, garden and parking area. Security features to be installed include CCTV, a key-card access system and security guards on duty 24 hours.

Condominium units will range between 33 and 97 square meters in size. Prices for those units start at about 1.8 million baht, while Town Home units will start at 5 million baht. Home Office units are priced at 5.7 million baht

Chanatsha Kheawchaoom, assistant marketing communications manager for Living Land told the *Gazette* that 40% of the condominium units have already been sold, as well as the two Home Office units.

Mr Patharalap Davivongsa, managing director of Living Land, said that The Clover Phuket will be aimed at middle-income Thai buyers (80%) and foreign expats (20%) wishing to buy a residence in Phuket. The project follows Living Land's The Clover Thonglor project in Bangkok.

Construction is being undertaken by Samcon Co Ltd and the project was designed by Process Architect and Planner Co Ltd.

not saying that we should invade more countries for a bit of a laugh, or go around playing Lynyrd Skynyrd at full tilt in the vicar's garden, or even scream and shout drunken schoolboy jokes in the middle of a group of meditating monks.

It's just that the people who go on about peace all the time are just, well, boring. Alright, I will concede that if the west were to invade one or two fewer countries on a regular basis, it might curb the whining hippie types' droning, but probably not. In all likelihood they'll find something else to whinge about.

I'm a bit of a nature fan myself, not averse to the outdoors, and I like to think that I respect my environment. These, in theory, should be universal ideas, not just those of the alleged 'hippie' movement.

I have to admit, I'm not sure about hippies. Both your sixties revolution-type hippies, most of whom are now in their sixties, and today's late teens - early 20something buffoons that attempt to pass themselves off as 'hip-

> Real hippies fight for causes that most alleged hippies know nothing about. They also actually take the time to read the newspaper, unlike those that choose to flap their gums about something they know nothing about. Maybe I do actually like proper hippies after all. I'm not sure all that "yeah, maan" stuff is really necessary though.

> Anyway, back to the peace thing. What would books, films and soap operas be like without a bit of aggression every now and then? Do we really want to see everyone living in peace and harmony with each other, having endless love-ins? Definitely not. We want a bit of action.

> Peace is decidedly tedious. As are the people who espouse it. What's their fascination with white doves, by the way? Where do all those doves appear from? > They could choose the peace lily. Also known as the spathiphyllum. It's a genus (part of a family) in itself; evergreen

herbaceous plants in the Araceae family. While strictly speaking the peace lily isn't actually a lily at all, this group of plants does produce stunning inflorescences, consisting of a white leaf-like 'spathe' bit, and a knobbly 'spadix' on which the actual flowers appear. The medium to dark green foliage contrasts magnificently with the blooms, highlighting the purity of the white color.

Most of the species and varieties available in Thailand have white blooms, although there are a few with light green blooms. Plants with green blooms are usually grown for their foliage value rather than for their flowers. Other bloom colors are conspicuously absent in this genus of plants.

The majority of peace lilies on offer in the west are hybrids of large species crossed with smaller species, producing just about the right size plant for indoors; it's one of the more popular houseplants in more temperate regions.

While green thumbs in the west struggle over the years just to keep their minuscule examples alive, and emit whoops of joy when the plants produce an attempt at a bloom, lilies here will grow to several times the occidental size without us trying too hard

Just about the only thing to bear in mind when you first bring one home from the garden center is that it will be happiest in a shaded spot in the garden; one that doesn't get too much light. It likes a fair bit of water and even has a way of telling you when it's thirsty. When it dries out, the leaves visibly droop, to the point where, if desperate for a drink, they will all lay flat on the ground.

Give it some water, and within a few hours the leaves bounce right back up to their original positions. For the most idle of gardeners, this would be a good indicator of when to water, except that by the time things reach the point of laying flat, the damage has been done. The roots die back slightly each time this happens, and if it happens often enough, the plant will eventually fail to come back at all.

In theory, lilies flower better when rootbound, so the best spot would be in a pot or planter. Thinking about it, you see the most dramatic examples of these in confined areas, such as between walls, so the theory might actually be right.

A huge number of hybrids have been produced over the years. Some growers will produce their own hybrids so they can give them names that distinguish their plants from the rest on the market.

An old standby is the spathiphyllum mauna loa (as pictured), a larger growing hybrid that has been around for decades.

Newer peace lilies, using spathiphyllum wallisii as one of the parents, are much smaller growers with darker green shiny leaves, and they are happy in even lower light conditions. Some of the newer varieties have variegated leaves, splotched or mottled white and creamy green.

The peace lily isn't really a plant that growers have to work too hard at – probably a good one for the hippies then. There's very little effort involved, and their common nickname does contain a word with which the hippies actually agree. Yeah, maan.


