Phuket Democrats hopeful

PHUKET: Phuket's two constituency MPs say they are looking forward to working with their new government coalition partners – including members of a faction loyal to former Democrat Party nemesis Newin Chidchob – in order to heal the nation's political rift and economic woes.

Both Democrats Tossaporn Tephabutra and Rewat Areerob were among 235 MPs who voted for Party leader Abhisit Vejjajiva during the extraordinary session of the lower house held on December 15 to find a replacement for former Prime Minister Somchai Wongsawat, whose People Power Party (PPP) was dissolved under a Constitutional Court ruling on December 2.

Among those backing Mr Abhisit were 37 members of the PPP's "Friends of Newin" faction, Isarn- based MPs loyal to Newin Chidchob, a former PPP executive who, like Mr Somchai, was banned from politics for five years by the court ruling.

Mr Newin is infamous in Phuket for leading the no-confidence debate that followed the Phuket SorPorKor land scandal that eventually led to the downfall of the first Chuan Leekpai administration in 1995.

After over a decade in the court system, resulting legal battles saw MP Tossaporn and several other Phuket tycoons lose SorPorKor land claimed by their families.

Despite the history between the two men, MP Tossaporn said he has no problem working with Newin's "friends".

"Mr Newin himself has no official position in government, as he has been banned from politics for five years. The Friends of Newin are concerned about the political turmoil in the nation, just as we are.

"I have had a chance to talk with Newin's supporters. They assured me that the Newin faction will support the govern-

ment's policies and that their main concern is finding solutions to their constituents' problems," he said.

Explaining that Mr Abhisit must appoint a Cabinet and state his policies before Parliament by year's end, he described the new government as a "New Year's gift to the Thai people" that will bring about national reconciliation.

The alliance will ease tensions between the anti-Thaksin "yellow shirts" of the People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) and the "red shirts" of the pro-Thaksin United Front for Democracy against Dictatorship (UDD), Mr Tossaporn said.

Because both the business sector and academia trust in Mr Abhisit's ability to tackle the social and economic crises, investor confidence will increase to create more jobs, thus easing social problems, he said.

"Î believe all parts of society will give the new government a chance to set policies that will benefit all Thai people," he said.

The coalition government

will likely get six to 12 months to work "without obstacles". If in that time it wins the people's trust, the Abhisit administration could govern until the end of its scheduled term in 2011, he said.

Asked about issues facing Phuket, he said global economic troubles would continue to drive job-seekers to the island from other parts of Thailand and abroad. Saying he has a plan to present to government on how to deal with this problem, Mr Tossaporn said Phuket needs to be a "good host" for people who come here to try to rebuild their lives

Simply trying to drive them away was not a viable solution, he added.

When asked about specific projects earmarked for Phuket, Mr Tossaporn said it was still too early to comment because Mr Abhisit's policy platform was still under discussion.

However, efforts are already underway to tackle the island's worsening traffic problem and the Transport Ministry is designing an underpass for the Darasamuth School intersection, with work on the project scheduled to begin in 2010, he revealed.

Asked about the long-talked-about plan to have Phuket upgraded to a "special administrative zone" like Pattaya, Mr Tossaporn said the emphasis at the current time should be on solving national economic and political problems, not trying to restructure the country.

Phuket's other constituency MP, Rewat Areerob, said he will press the government to find solutions to the worsening unemployment problem, particularly in the hard-hit tourism sector. He suggested that tax breaks for tourism businesses would allow companies to retain more of their staff.

The *Gazette* also contacted Chalermlak Kepsap, another Democrat who represents Phuket as a party-list MP under the new proportional representation system. However, her secretary said Ms Chalermlak did not care to comment on political matters at this time.





Kiwi speedster nabbed

New Zealand was arrested by Kamala police for alleged possession of ya bah, ya ice, ecstasy and marijuana last week.

Peter Scharmach, 44, was arrested at a police checkpoint in Kathu at 12.30am on December 13. Scharmach is a well known figure within car racing circles in New Zealand.

Kamala police say that officers at the checkpoint asked Scharmach if they could check his vehicle, a black Honda Jazz. When he reacted suspiciously they carried out a search of his car, finding a backpack containing a *ya bah* tablet, 1.4 grams of ya ice, 0.79 grams of ecstasy

KAMALA: A racing driver from and 12.41 grams of marijuana. The bag also contained 42,000 baht in cash and drug paraphernalia.

> Scharmach was taken to Kamala police station and charged with possession of Class 1 drugs and possession of a Class 5 drug with intent to supply.

> He is understood to have pleaded not guilty to the charges, claiming that he is a successful businessman who does not make his money selling drugs.

> Scharmach's lawyer has requested bail for his client so that he can travel to Germany for business reasons before returning to Thailand for his court appearance, set for January 13.

Kajonkietsuksa School bus crashes



THALANG: Fourteen tired students and staff of Kajonkietsuksa School returning home from Haad Yai had a rude awakening on the night of December 16, when the bus they were traveling on crashed into the Heroines' Monument roundabout at about 10 pm.

The bus, nearing the end of an eight-hour journey, was carrying seven of the school's top students, seven teachers plus the driver. The youths, from both primary and secondary levels, won the Phuket round of an education contest to earn the right to enter the regional competition in Haad Yai, where they took fifth place.

As the bus was circumnavigating the monument roundabout, a pickup truck coming from the direction of Pa Khlok apparently cut them off, causing the bus to crash into the circle, a source at the school said.

Nobody was seriously injured in the accident, nor were either of the two iconic statues in the circle's center damaged.

There were reports of fighting at the entrance to the Sukhumvit Road beer bar complex in Patong, which was boarded up for the night of December 11 as a way of encouraging tenants to sign new contracts with Moodies Entertainment, which has reclaimed the right to operate the complex.

PATONG: Scores of publicans running beer bars at Sukhumvit Road night entertainment complex on Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Rd were locked out of their businesses on December 11 after refusing to sign new rental agreements with Moodies Entertainment, which has reclaimed the right to operate the complex.

Kathu Police Inspector Sophon Borrirak told the Gazette that he received a report from Moodies saying the action was taken because many publicans operating beer bars in the twostory complex were in breach of contract.

According to Lt Col Sophon, Moodies representatives told police that they had rented out the complex to Sukhumvit Road Entertainment Co Ltd, who subdivided it into beer bars and established rental contracts with their proprietors and opened the Night Station disco at the rear.

According to Moodies, the company stopped paying the agreed rental fee, so Moodies wanted the tenants to sign new rental agreements directly with the firm.

However, the tenants – many of them with financial support from foreigners - initially

refused to do so, saying they already had legally binding contracts with Sukhumvit Road Entertainment.

Moodies told police that they are preparing to take legal action against the company, Lt Col Sophon said.

The Gazette has been unable to contact either Moodies General Manager Chris Koppers or Wattana Meetam of Sukhumvit Road Entertainment Co Ltd for more information about the legal dispute.

Before moving to Phuket, Mr Meetam ran the Sukhumvit Square Night Entertainment Area on Soi 10 of Bangkok's Sukhumvit Rd, which was bulldozed in a pre-dawn raid carried out by paramilitary thugs in January,

A week after the December 11 blockade, some foreign bar owners had reportedly signed new contracts with Moodies. Others said they were confused because they hadn't received clear information from either party in the dispute.

At least one was considering moving out of the complex due to what he perceived as the threat of possible violence to his family and staff.

Chalong Traffic Police told the Gazette both Thai and foreign motorists are subject to inspections at the checkpoint. "We are checking for ve-

hicle registrations, driving licenses, insurance stickers and making sure motorcyclists are wearing crash helmets and car drivers wearing safety belts. We are also monitoring people's driving behavior," he said.

The 365 Dangerous Days safety campaign, launched by the Royal Thai Police at the beginning of August, runs until the end of July 2009.

The current safety crackdown has already yielded results, according to police, with no road fatalities being recorded in November in Chalong Police District, which covers Rawai, Kata and Karon.

"This is good news for Thais as well as foreigners because it ensures that all motorists are aware of Thai traffic laws, which are different to those in other countries. When foreigners come to Thailand, they need to obtain an international driver's license or get a Thai driving license by passing a test at a Department of Land Transport office," he added.

Those failing to comply with minor law are subject to the following fines:

- No vehicle registration: 1,000 baht.
- Failure to wear a crash helmet while operating a motorbike: 500 baht.

For more serious offenses requiring legal proceedings, the following penalties apply:

- Fake documents:

1,000 to 10,000 baht fine, or 6 months to 5 years in jail, or both. - Drunk driving (blood alcohol

content > 0.05%):

Not involved in an accident: A fine of 5,000 to 20,000 baht, or 6 months in jail, or both.

Offenders will also have their driving license confiscated and be liable for court costs.

Foreign offenders may be subject to investigation by Immigration Police.

After an accident:

A fine from 20,000 to 40,000 baht, or 3 years in jail, or both.

After an accident resulting in the death of another person: A fine from 40,000 to 80,000 baht and up to 10 years in jail.



Lack of water treatment facilities threatens tourism

KATA: Kata Beach is a popular destination for many tourists who visit Phuket, yet despite its popularity, the area's antiquated drainage system is sending filthy and foul smelling water into the sea, polluting some of Phuket's pristine beaches.

At the heart of the problem lies Kata Beach's dilapidated and archaic drainage system, with its outmoded drain covers and the proliferation of open air water through-flow areas. Chatporn Chroenwetch, the government director responsible for the treatment and management of water, confirmed that the age of the existing network is the primary con-

"It is an old drain that we have been using for sometime but we have already drawn up plans to install a new system that will filter out the dirty water. We have also received 12 million baht of funding to replace the old sys-

With plans in place and funding secured, the upgrade of the drainage network was opposed by Club Med Phuket, which argued that the Karon Municipality did not have the right to develop land owned by the resort.

While Club Med's attempt to block the planned redevelopment languishes in the court system, legal red tape requires that the old system remains in use.

Another serious problem arises through foul smells emerging from Kata Beach's open-slot drain tops. Due to the covers not being completely sealed, many

tourists are having their sense of smell assailed by the stench of septic water. Kata resident, James Eric Gibson, informed the Gazette, "Every time I step over a drain I can smell the water below. If I park over a drain, the smell fills the inside of my car."

Mr Chatporn insisted that plans were afoot to tackle the

"We have already received funding from the Government to replace all the existing open slot drains in 2009. We have also hired the Eastern Thai company to check, repair, clean and maintain the existing drains within the Kata Beach resort."

Potentially, the greatest worry is the flow of polluted water into the sea. The expansion of tourism over recent years has dramatically increased the amount of water used by the resort, resulting in higher levels of pollu-

Many hotels within the Municipality have installed water treatment facilities but the number of tourists simply overloads the process and the excess water is allowed to flow into the sea. Mr Chatporn alluded to another plan to tackle the issue concerning hotel water.

"In 2009, if hotel water doesn't meet the Biological Oxygen Demand (BOD), the benchmarking tool of water quality, then we will prevent the water from entering the main drainage system until it is clean enough to do so."

Foreigners allowed to stay as long as they like, must leave every 15 days

PHUKET CITY: Phuket Immigration held a press conference on December 16 to announce recent changes in Immigration rules. The announcement confirms that foreigners arriving at any of Thailand's land checkpoints without visas will be granted permits-to-stay of only 15 days, just half the former number of 30 days.

The press conference was led by Phuket Immigration Superintendent Chanatpol Yongbunjerd, who also confirmed that the former rule preventing foreigners entering on "visa exemptions" from staying more than 90 days over a 180-day period was no longer in effect.

As a result, foreigners from any of the 40 countries eligible for visa exemptions can now reside in Thailand as long as they wish, provided they don't mind making "visa runs" every 15 days.

The new rule is in effect at all 54 land border checkpoints, including Ranong, the most popular destination for foreigners living in Phuket who need to make visa runs to remain in compliance with immigration regulations.

Col Chanatpol said the new order, issued on November 25, was introduced as a way of cracking down on foreigners working illegally in the country, such as those involved in the real estate industry.

On the issue of illegal foreign laborers, Col Chanatpol said he thought that the number of alien workers currently residing in Phuket was probably in the region of 70,000 to 80,000.

Col Chanatpol used the occasion of the announcement to introduce two new Immigration Inspectors assigned to Phuket Immigration.

Kanya "Taen" Petchpairoj will be in charge of visa issues and administrative matters, and Lt Col Suparerk Pankosol, who was recently transferred from Samut Prakan, will be in charge of investigations.

Phuket Carnival signals official start to high season

hree local boys from Muang Thalang school recently represented Thailand at the Asia-Pacific Regional Space Agency Forum -15 (APRSAF-15) Water Rocket Challenge in Vietnam on December 13.

The APRSAF has held an annual competition since its inception in 1993. This year's final was held in Hanoi, Vietnam with the Muang Thalang school representing the kingdom by dint of winning the country's national finals.

Mr. Manop, a teacher who acted as a consultant to the boys told the *Gazette*, "We have been entering the national water rocket competition for the past 3 years but only managed to win the competition for the South of the country. Phuket Governor, Preecha Ruangjan, visited Muang Thalang high school earlier in the week to offer his best wishes and congratulations to the group of students destined for Vietnam.

In Hanoi they competed against teams from around the Asia-Pacific region launching a rocket made here in Phuket.

In judging water rocket competitions, the score is determined by the point where the rocket makes initial contact with the ground in relation to the target, positioned 57.5 meters from the launcher.

The maximum score possible is 100 points per launch, which is awarded if the rocket strikes the target.

A water rocket uses compressed gas as its power source and the vessel most commonly used is a plastic bottle.

The bottle is partly filled with water and then sealed. It is then pressurized with gas, usually air compressed from a bicycle pump or air compressor up to a pressure of 125 pounds per square inch (psi).

Occasionally, carbon dioxide or nitrogen is used from a cylinder. The seal on the nozzle of the rocket is then released, causing a rapid release of water. The sudden expulsion of water is often able to propel the rocket a prodigious distance into the air.

Heights and flight duration are determined by aerodynamics, the volume of water, the initial pressure, the rocket nozzle's size, and the unloaded weight of the rocket.

Typical launch pressures vary from 75 to 150 psi. The higher the pressure, the larger the stored energy and the further the rocket is propelled.

LATEST: As the *Gazette* went to press the official result of the APRSAF was announced. The winner of the event was Singapore with Japan in second place and the Phuket team representing Thailand finishing a highly creditable third.



Marine farm sustains livelihoods

he Rassada December 26 fishery group on December 11 joined with the Phuket Provincial Fisheries Office to launch a project at the group's offshore fish farm aimed at educating people about the principles of a sufficiency economy and encouraging agricultural tourism.

Phuket Governor Preecha Ruangjan presided over the opening ceremony, culminating in the release of 500,000 newly hatched sea perch and shrimp into the sea as part of a merit-making ceremony in honor of HM The King Bhumibol Adulyadej's 81st birthday on December 5.

Gov Preecha presented the farm with new floating pens and other equipment, which had been donated by Hilfswerk Austria, an EU-sponsored development organization that has supported the fishery since 2007.

The Rassada December 26 group, which now has 31 members, was set up on July 26, 2006 and named after the date of the tsunami that devastated the area in 2004. The group was established to help fisherman living along Soi Kingkaew in Rassada to rebuild their livelihoods following the disaster.

The Kingkaew fish farm is located around 1 kilometer out to sea from Soi Kingkaew, in tambon Rassada's Village 3. Its 32 pens currently hold around 500 grouper fish, 2,400 sea perch and 10,000 sea oysters. The group also aims to begin farming mussels in January.

The farm is restocked either by buying young fish from other farms or catching them in the sea and raising them for later sale or consumption.

The fish farm also incorporates Rassada Crab Bank, which was launched on January 10,





2008 and now consists of eight pens containing horse crabs (portunus pelagicus) and black crabs (scylla serrata). The crab bank was established in a bid to restore the crab population in the waters around Rassada.

Local fishermen "deposit" any ovulating females they catch to allow them to reproduce in the bank's pens. Currently around 40 crabs a day are deposited in this way.

After ovulation is complete, the females are then sold, while the eggs are cultivated in the pens. The group estimates the farm now holds around 1,200 crabs and 6 million eggs.

Rassada December 26 is led by its president, Jaran Than-Udon, who conceived the latest project. The project will involve young people visiting the farm to




learn about fish farming and sufficiency economy principles.

"We have a lecturer who can teach students how to farm many kinds of fish based on our real experiences and the problems we've faced," Mr Jaran said.

The group also intends to host visits from groups of tourists who want to learn more about fishing farming.


Speaking about the accusation that the Kingkaew community have encroached illegally on the land they live on, Jaran Than-Udon told the *Gazette* "Nowadays a lot of people think we have encroached on the land. But we want people to know that we are going to improve this place and turn it into a center for local people to learn more about fishing."













Youth loses face in explosive sex act

Lunar perigee brightens the night sky

ast Friday December 12, the moon was visibly bigger and brighter than usual, as it reached its closest point to the earth in recent years. Luckily for stargazers in Phuket, there were few clouds in the night sky, enabling people to see the moon at about 14 percent larger and 30 percent brighter that usual. According to NASA, Earth's satellite was 30,000 miles (48,000 kilometers) closer to Earth than at the other extreme of its elliptical orbit. The following night, Phuketians were treated to a display of celestial fireworks in the form of a midnight meteor shower (leonids), which is an annual event that occurs when the earth passes through the dust trail of a comet that was first recorded in 1895 and has a 33-year orbit.



Belgian man's racing pigeon proves to be top of the coop

CHIANG MAI: Of 708 racing pigeons that took off from Chiang Mai on the inaugural Thailand Grand Pigeon Race on December 11, just 150 made it to Bangkok. They were competing to win a royal trophy and big cash prizes for their owners.

The winner, landing on its cage on top of a building in Bangkok's Yannawa district after a marathon 575-kilometer flight, belongs to Belgian national Chris Hebberecht. It fluttered in sharp at 4.06 pm.

Winging in a few minutes later, at 4.18 pm, were six Thai birds. Thanks to his speedy pigeon, Hebberecht will win a trophy from His Majesty the King and a cash prize of just over one million baht.

Birds registered in the race have owners from Belgium, the Netherlands, Romania, Britain, Switzerland and, of course, Thailand.

The arrival times of the pigeons were recorded by a computer linked to microchips implanted in the birds.

Before the final leg from Chiang Mai to Bangkok, the pigeons had flown races from Nakhon Sawan, Phichit and Uttaradit to the capital.

"This is a colorful activity and should help boost the country's tourism," commented Chiang Mai deputy governor Chuchart Keelapaeng.

The race was jointly organised by Thailand's Racing Pigeon Federation, the Grand Pet Show and Friendship Associations.

Ministry warns of bronchitis risk

Children and the elderly should take extra care of their health to avoid developing bronchitis, the Ministry of Public Health Ministry (MoPH) warned on December 11.

Symptoms of high fever, severe cough and chest pain warrant an immediate visit to the doctor, said ministry permanent secretary Dr Prat Boonyavongvirot.

Almost 43,200 people nationwide suffered from bronchitis last winter, with the Northeast the hardest hit, he said. Around 14,000 patients were from that region.

In addition to the elderly and young children, other high risk groups include chain smokers and HIV/Aids patients.

According to the Bureau of Epidemiology, last year 142,250 people caught bronchitis, with 1,043 dying from it. Bronchitis is still the major cause of fatalities in children under five.

Crackdown on illegal dorms

From January 1 next year, student dormitory owners who do not legally register their quarters could face up to six months in jail for violating the Dormitory Act, according to Acting Social Development and Human Security Minister Udomdet Rattanasathien.

Mr Udomdet added that all dorms outside university campuses would be inspected to ascertain whether they are registered with the ministry. A recent survey recorded some 30,000 dorms across the country, of which only 12,739 were registered.

Legally, a dormitory is defined as a rental residence providing for five students or more, aged under 25, who are studying for a bachelor's degree or at lower levels. The residence must be registered as a legal dormitory and its owner must separate dormitories for male and female students.

Chiang Mai canopy walkway to be longest in SE Asia

CHIANG MAI: The Natural Resources and Environment Ministry's Botanical Garden Organization will invest 50 million baht to build Thailand's first canopy walkway in the Queen Sirikit Botanical Garden in Chiang Mai's Mae Rim district, a senior official has announced.

Organisation president Withoon Karuna said the walkway, 350 meters long, will help research and stimulate eco-tourism. Still at the design phase, it should be completed by 2010,

Before the project starts, an environmental impact assessment would be carried out to prevent damage to the 6,500-rai garden. If completed as planned, the walkway would be Southeast Asia's longest canopied walkway, he added.

Although the walkway is primerily intended to benefit research, it could boost tourism at least threefold from the current 300,000 visits per year, Mr Withoon said. At present, there are only a few canopied walkways in Asia, including one in Malaysia's Kinabalu National Park and the recently completed Lu Bukit Hijau Park, and another in Brunei's Ulu Temburong National Park.

More females are smoking

The number of Thai women smokers is expected to drastically rise from 1,664,000 in 2000 to 12 million by 2025, according to the Action on Smoking and Health Thailand Foundation.

However, a survey conducted last year by the National Statistical Office shows that only 17,059 women were habitual smokers.

The foundation's secretary Dr Prakit Wateesatokkit, said the rising number of female smokers could be blamed upon the intensive marketing strategies employed by tobacco companies.

"We have to address this issue immediately and educate them about the dangers of smoking," he said.

Another study carried out this year by Chulalongkorn University found that the key reason behind pregnant women smoking was that they wanted to try it out, were persuaded by friends or believed cigarettes helped them relax.

The study, conducted on 1,600 pregnant women nationwide at an average age of 27, showed that most were first-time mothers and had every intention of breastfeeding their infants. Most of the respondents said they were finding it difficult to quit because people around them smoked, that it had become a habit or that they were addicted. Though most seemed to know about the risks of contracting cancer and other tobacco-related diseases, not many knew that pregnant smokers risked pre-term labor and ectopic pregnancy, while their infants were at increased risk of dwarfism and other birth defects.

Ranger rampages on train

RAT: One person died and six others were injured when an army ranger opened fire on fellow passengers on a train passing through Nakhon Sri Thammarat on December 10.

The gunman, 21-year-old Aekalak Pudpong, was arrested at the scene.

Police Superintendent Col Pasapon Tawichsri said mental health experts would be brought in to help question the man, who was unable to speak coherently following his arrest.

Mr Aekalak was given a urine test to see if he had abused any substances, but results were unavailable at press time.

According to available information, the Narathiwat-based ranger boarded a Bangkok-bound train to visit his family in Chumphon. Around 10 pm, Mr Ekalak started shooting.

Witnesses say Mr Ekalak was returning from the toilet at around 10 pm when he suddenly pulled out a gun and opened fire on passengers.

Najjawa Sani, a 20-year-old nursing student, was killed immediately, while Sabiya Sayoh, 22; Kama Bibing, 23; Abdullah Yimadiloj, 25; and Pongsakorn Anusit, 21; were severely injured.

NAKHON SRI THAMMA- Pongsakorn was a member of the train catering staff. A few other passengers received minor injuries. Witnesses said an on-duty policeman on the train subdued and arrested Ekalak.

Late night attack

SONGKHLA: A man was seriously injured after being shot while driving in Songkhla's Bang Klam District on December 11. Police are unsure whether the target of the attack was the driver or his female passenger, only known as Wan, and the owner of a karaoke bar in Haad Yai. She escaped unscathed.

The pair were driving through Tambon Tha Chang about 1:30 am when two men on a motorcycle pulled up close behind them and fired shots through the back window of the car before speeding away.

The driver, 35-year-old Chalerm Nawadech, was hit in his right shoulder.

Afraid the gunmen would return. Mr Chalerm managed to keep control of the vehicle and drive on to Haad Yai Police Station. From there he was taken to Haad Yai Hospital, where doctors operated on him and later announced him out of danger.

Monk survives assult by thieves

NAKHON SRI THAMMA-RAT: Police in Nakhon Sri Thammarat's Muang District arrested three youths for allegedly stabbing a monk and throwing him from the third floor of his temple's administration building, where he caught them burgling.

The monk, 35-year-old Phra Chuchart Inthapunyo, survived the attack but remains in intensive care at Maharaj Hospital where he was treated for stab wounds to the head, ear, neck, ribs and stomach. He also broke his left arm and left leg in the fall.

Police said that they believe Phra Chuchart heard a noise and on seeing men rifling through the temple's artefacts, shouted for help before being set upon by the robbers. The men then ran out of the building and drove away on two motorbikes.

On December 12, police arrested the three suspects as they were drinking in a rented house next to the temple. Police named the suspects as: Narongchan Phukkarat, 21, a third year law student at a well-known local university; Somchai Khongchum, 19, who is unemployed, and another youth who police identified only as Phanuphong, 18, the son of the owner of a chain of construction material shops, reportedly worth hundreds of millions of baht.

Police said the youths confessed that they were trying to rob the temple to get money to spend on alcohol and threatened Phra Chuchat when he disturbed them, but he refused to back down so they attacked him.

However, all three denied throwing him off the balcony, claiming that he fell while trying to escape. Police said they do not believe the youths, but will have to wait to interview Phra Chuchart before drawing any firm conclusions.

All three youths have been charged with robbery and attempted murder.

Phanuphong's father tried to bail out his son, but police refused and said they would also object to bail being granted in the court.

UNICEF surveys Southern children

Children growing up in the deep South show symptoms of anxiety and stress, but do not blame religion as a cause of the local unrest, a United Nations survey has found.

"We are committed to raising awareness of the situation of these children and enabling them to tell their own story and to ensuring their voices are heard and their rights are respected," said Tomoo Hozumi, Thai representative for the United Nations Children's Fund.

The report, called 'Everyday Fears: Children's perceptions of living in the southern border area of Thailand' also showed local children's positive outlook in that that none of them expressed a biased or negative view of other religions.

The study was conducted between 2006-2007 among 2,357 Muslim and Buddhist children aged 7-17 from 56 communities in Narathiwat, Pattani, Yala and Songkhla, where daily violence has killed at least 3,000 people since late 2003.

One-third of the respondents do not want to take revenge on the rebels, while another third wanted to.

The last third did not express an opinion.

"I don't want to see blood, the dead and grieving people when the head of their family dies anymore," said Sahadam Waeyusoh, 16, a child representative from Pattani, who has witnessed four battles between armed soldiers and militants.

UNICEF Thailand's child protection officer, Settasak Akanimart, said the research study also offered recommendations for follow-up action.

They include promoting awareness of children's rights and child protection among civil society and all armed groups, providing peace-building education and activities for children, banning corporal punishment in schools, and strengthening mechanisms for reporting and responding to violence against children within families, communities and schools.

A cracking Christmas pudding recipe

he festive season is all about feeling full and it just wouldn't be the same without a Christmas pudding sitting proudly on the table, drawing appreciative sighs from relatives as the remains of the turkey are cleared away.

But as the lights dim and flames lick over the top of grandma's festive handiwork, everyone realizes the awful truth: nobody wants to eat any; they're simply too full from the mounds of chocolate, sweets and dinner they've been gorging themselves on all morning.

Despite feeling like geese being fattened for *foie gras*, everyone takes a portion of pudding that, although small, somehow weighs roughly the same as a baby blue whale.

As if that's not enough, brandy butter, as rich a sauce as you could find on planet earth, is poured in generous measure over each bowlful.

Daunted by the prospect of tucking in, some of the less corpulent family members attempt to dodge their Yuletide duty, but in the name of Christ-

mas spirit and good cheer, all are eventually garrisoned into the painful process of slowly working their way through Christmas dinner's time-honored climax.

If you want to have a go at making your own Christmas pudding, read on, for a simple recipe. Traditionally, a coin is dropped into the mixture, which every member of the family should stir for good luck, and then everyone has to ensure that they don't swallow, break a tooth or choke on the "lucky" coin. All that remains then, is to undo your belt, let it all hang out and contemplate the prospect of watching your uncle snoring in front of the compulsory James Bond film trotted out each year.

Traditionalists will contest that this recipe should have appeared in the *Gazette* at least a month ago to give sufficient time to soak the fruits and berries in the rich, alcoholic mixture that produces a moist pudding, which ideally, is served with a brandy or whiskey sauce. But you can always save this Christmas edition of the *Gazette* for next year and be well prepared to mix up your pudding in September.

Recipe

With the following ingredients, you can make a 4-pound pudding. That's just under 2kg of stodge in metric measurements. You will need:

- 3 ounces of flour
- 5 ounces of bread crumbs
- 5 ounces of suet
- 1 1/4 pounds of mixed dried fruit (currents, raisins etc.)
- The rind of 1 small orange
- The rind of 1 small lemon
- 1 small cooking apple (grated)
- 2 eggs
- 1 tablespoonful of treacle
- ½ teaspoonful of mixed spice
- ½ teaspoonful of cinnamon
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoonful of nutmeg
- 1 small carrot
- 6 ounces of sugar (brown or white)
- 4 ounces of sugared fruit peel A pinch of salt



Preparation

In a large bowl, mix the flour, bread crumbs and suet along with the mixed dried fruit. Then add the grated orange and lemon rind and grated apple, plus the juice from the fruits. As you mix, add the eggs, treacle, spices and other ingredients.

This is the point where you add a teaspoon of alcohol to the mixture, such as whiskey or brandy. The mixture then needs to stand overnight in a covered bowl. The next day, place the mixture into a well-greased pudding bowl. Cover and seal it with grease-proof paper and seal it up with string.

Cooking

Christmas puddings are cooked by steaming them, so use a pressure cooker (about two hours), or place the pudding in a bowl, which is put inside a water-filled pan on the stove. This takes about four hours. The lengthy cooking time is due to the pudding being so dense. The pudding can then be kept until you are ready to serve.


Serving

When it's time to serve the pudding, it will need to be reheated. Whatever you do, don't try and speed up the warming process by putting the pudding in a microwave, as this traditional dessert does not take kindly to modern culinary treatment, and will redecorate your kitchen in a colorful explosion of bibulous sultanas and suet mix if you attempt to do so.

Instead, warm the pudding in a saucepan of water on low heat for approximately two hours, but don't let any water enter the pudding or the saucepan boil dry.

For special blue-flame effects, pour two tablespoons of highproof whiskey over the pudding, before you dim the lights, and set the pudding alight. Oh, and have some warm custard or brandy sauce on hand to pour over the pudding for that snow-topped pudding effect.

New hybrids on the horizon



The new Insight is powered by a version of Honda's IMA hybrid system. It also includes interactive, driver-focused fuel economy enhancement technology.

he CEOs of Detroit's "Big Three" car manufacturers, Alan Mulally, Rick Wagoner and Bob Nardelli, were once famously lambasted for traveling to Congress by corporate jet. On their next trip to Capitol Hill, they traveled in hybrid cars.

The Toyota Prius was the first hybrid sedan to come to market back in the late '90s following the appearance of a concept hybrid at the 1995 Tokyo

Motor Show. It was a rudimentary small car with a supplementary electric motor to aid or replace the gasoline engine, depending on conditions.

Contrary to popular belief, hybrids have been around for almost 100 years, but it is only due to environmental concerns – and of course the relatively high price of oil – that they have become so fashionable today.

Hybrids are currently all the rage, with the Toyota Prius sell-

ing more than a million since its introduction, and Honda offering – at least in the United States – dual-motor Civics. Honda intends to launch its second-generation Insight hybrid in January, and it will be shown at the 2009 North American International Auto Show (NAIAS) in Detroit.

The new five-passenger, five-door Insight is powered by a lighter, more compact version of Honda's IMA hybrid system and will go on sale in early 2009. The



The latest hybrid offering from Audi is a seven-seat SUV called Q7.

Insight is expected to have annual global sales of 200,000 units per year and will utilize a new interactive, driver-focused fuel economy enhancement technology named the Ecological Drive Assist System.

Toyota moved into the luxury hybrid segment with the launch in 2007 of the Lexus RX400h SUV and the Lexus LS600h luxury saloon. Audi has also taken the opportunity to offer a seven-seat SUV hybrid with the introduction of the innovative Q7 Hybrid. Porsche intends to introduce a hybrid version of its forthcoming Panamera four-door sportscar, while BMW, Volkswagen and, of course, the ailing Detroit companies are all working on various hybrid models.

The Prius has been hugely successful across the world, although there are those who question the true effectiveness of its hybrid technology. True, it improves fuel consumption and, while the electric motor is powering the car, is virtually pollutionfree. However, analysts calculate that from production to destruction – that is the entire lifespan of the vehicle – it is one of the least efficient models. To recycle or dispose of the batteries, the electrical windings and various other hi-tech components is vastly more expensive, both in monetary and environmental terms, than a conventional vehicle.

No engine technology alone can deliver an optimal solution to the emissions problem. All fuel solutions have their shortcomings. Gasoline engines emit less nitrogen oxide than diesel engines and produce insignificant levels of particulate matter. Diesel engines, on the other hand, are more fuel efficient and produce less carbon dioxide than gasoline.

Among non-petroleum power sources, electric vehicles, for example, are clean, but cannot deliver satisfying overall drive performance or acceptable driving range, and always have to be recharged.


But what if different power sources were combined to enhance their respective benefits and reduce shortcomings?

This leap forward has been achieved in the creation of the Toyota Hybrid System, now one of the company's core vehicle technologies.

The revolutionary breakthrough achieved by hybrid technology is the intelligent management of the energy flows from two different power sources, so that each segment of driving – acceleration, open road, braking and stop-go – is performed in an environmentally and mechanically beneficial way.

Toyota's system, known as "hybrid synergy drive", powers the latest Toyota Prius, giving the Prius nitrogen oxide emissions of 0.01 g/km, and hydrocarbon emissions of 0.02 g/km. By 2010 the demand for hybrid cars is expected to account for at least 5% of all passenger vehicle sales.

Humans are unique beings with a balance of mental and physical facilities, beautifully constructed by nature, and further blessed with the ability to invent, develop and preserve.


Lack of insight and awareness leads the mind to blindness, shallowness, negativity and hatred: destroying humanity and our own happiness.



"The Asia Superyacht Rendez-Vous is planned as an annual event and represents Phuket's coming of age as a major yachting destination with the international community," he adds.





Peera Pongchompu has created the "Ocean" series, a collection of acrylic paintings that explores the depths of emotion. His paintings are dark, moody and sophisticated.

While concerned with the female form, her use of fluid texture, hiding or covering her female images, adds layers of complexity to the canvas.



Inflation is the only solution to the crisis

t is, sadly, all too common for followers of economic news to be assailed with comments Like, "The economy will find matters difficult for the first half of 2009 but the second half will see a recovery." Or ,"We are currently in a bottoming process and are likely to build from here."

It's true that something of a rally is going on in some stock markets this month but, as Simon Grose-Hodge, director of strategy at LGT Liechtenstein said in an interview on CNBC, "Any rally in stock markets in December will be taken in January". He also said that if the European Central Bank (ECB) did not move decisively on reducing interest rates, Europe would be the last region to exit the global recession.

However, it is difficult to have much faith in the ECB. In July, it raised interest rates, believing inflation to be the primary problem. it now understands that inflation is the least of its problems and that interest rates have to be cut to fight the true enemy; recession. However, their response has been tepid, compared with other central banks. Even China has had four rate cuts since

The current economic turmoil is so severe that some analysts say it's the worst in twenty years. Others say it's the worst in a century. Alan Brown, a senior executive with asset management group Schroders plc, recently said that the current crisis was the worst since the Great Depression, which was more than 70 years ago. He says Schroders sees the UK economy contracting by 2% in 2009 and the US by 1.5%. He also sees interest rate yields reaching zero. Schroders hopes for a modest recovery in 2010 but describe this as being more "an act of faith" than anything else.

In an in-depth interview on CNBC, legendary analyst Meredith Whitney, Executive Director of Equity Research with US financial group Oppenheimer & Co., predicted that US house prices will fall by another 20% – a total drop of 40%. The US consumer is entering a period of "forced deleveraging" with banks and other financial institutions often refusing to extend existing lines of credit, including credit card debt.

Ms Whitney went on to say that between 2000 and 2008, five trillion dollars was financed by securitization of home loans.

None of this money would be available in future. Securitization of home loans has, obviously, come to a halt, permanently.

The yield on three-month US Treasury notes has fallen to zero. At times, it has even shown a negative return. The reason for this unusual situation is simply a flight to safety.

In the midst of all this, it may seem incredible that equity markets are able to show a rally in prices. However, there are good underlying reasons. Firstly, many investors, usually institutional, are "shorting" the market at the slightest sign of any rally. It is necessary for them to buy back the shares that they are "shorting" to avoid making losses on their strategy.

Secondly, many investors simply "dollar cost average" their investments, creating regular demand. Lastly, there are always investors, usually retail, who believe the market has bottomed and wish to enter.

Bear market rallies are often very sharp and substantial. The behaviour of the Dow Jones Index in the early 1930s is a perfect example of how volatile a bear market can trade.

Most of the economic conditions apparent in the US economy can also be seen in the UK, such as extraordinarily high levels of consumer debt, combined with bank balance sheets under severe stress.

The one major difference is the housing market. The US built enormous numbers of new dwellings during the last boom but the UK produced far less housing stock. The difference between the two countries (after population adjustments) is also partly accounted for by the number of old dwellings in the UK that had to be condemned.

The current recession is not "normal" for its type. Recessions are usually brought on by excess demand leading to rising inflation. In a "normal" recession, central

banks simply raise interest rates to force demand downwards and recession is simply caused by central banks intervening too late and having to take measures that are simply overkill. Sometimes, central banks are simply "lucky". A perfect example was the US economy in the mid 1990s, where interest rate moves by the US central bank (US Federal Reserve) simply cooled the economy without a recession. Even Alan Greenspan, who was then Chairman of the US Federal Reserve, openly states that he does not quite understand "how they got away with it". This is known as a "soft landing".

The current recession is led by debt and is much more difficult to resolve. Simply reducing interest rates will not solve the problem. However, economics, like medicine, has made enormous strides in terms of treatment and understanding since the 1930s.

But, for economies in the US and UK, debt levels are going to take years to fall to reasonable territory. Recovery requires demand, which will have to come from new areas.

Some hope the demand will come from the middle classes of countries such as China and India. Unfortunately, these wouldbe consumers seem to be more interested in saving money than spending it.

In the short term, many governments are going to have to create demand themselves. Unfortunately, most are already running deficits, so government debt burdens will rise.

However, they are aware of the trap that Japan fell into in the 1990s with infrastructural spending, so demand must be created on a massive and rapid scale. Anything less will just make the problem worse.

Next year, the US will be building roads, bridges, public buildings and schools at an enormous rate. They will need to spend huge amounts of money in the shortest possible time to counteract a falling private sector. Meredith Whitney is correct when she says that the result will not please capitalists.


The result will be enormous government-sector debt. There is one tried and tested way of reducing massive debt: inflation.







ing Chulalongkom (Rama V) was the first-ever Siamese monarch to visit Phuket. During his second visit to the south of Siam in 1890, the king kept a journal of his travels, and a few pages are dedicated to Phuket. They describe his visit in vivid detail, giving local historians a rare insight into 19th century Phuket from the point of view of the sovereign himself, one of the most influential men in the history of Thailand.

On May 1, 1890, King Chulalongkorn and his entourage disembarked from the royal yacht in Phuket Bay and set foot on the island at what is now Saphan Hin, the closest port to Phuket Town. According to his account, many people were present to welcome him. Awaiting him in front of the port master's office were His

Majesty's Bangkok guards along with several government officials as well as the leaders of some of the local Chinese labor organizations

The procession then moved to the royal pavilion, which had been prpared in advance. Clearly, no expense had been spared in constructing this makeshift residency

According to the king, it was decorated in Sino-Western style and included a number of traditional *sala* (resting houses) and Western-style gardens, surrouning the pavilion area. The pavilion was constructed out of wood and featured an audience hall, bedroom and dining room

among other facilities. The decorations and furniture inside the pavilion were described as "Penang style". "There is everything here that is needed," the king observed.

Some new roads were constructed and old roads were duly repaired to facilitate travel for the king. The road to Thalang, for example, was upgraded especially for the occasion.

Despite these efforts, some roads that were in a dire state of repair, such as the one leading to Kathu, were left untouched, forcing the king's visit to be canceled.

Most of the funding for the construction and repairs to the pavilion came from rich Chinese entrepreneurs based on the island.

Over the course of the day, many high ranking officials, prominent citizens and community leaders came to the king's residency and were granted an audience. Captain Weber, an English official stationed in Phuket, also paid the king a visit. From his account, King Chulalongkorn had previously met the captain on his first visit to the island. He remarked that he didn't recognize him immediately as the captain had aged a lot.

At 3 pm on the same day, His Majesty went to visit a Chinese operated tin mine behind the pavilion. The mine belonged to Phuket noble Luang Bumrung, who had managed it for 25 years and had five other tin mines in neighboring tambons, employing more than 1,300 miners, 900 in the one visited by the king.

The king remarked that this mine produced very large quantities of tin and that in Phuket the mines in general were a lot deeper than in Ranong.

Luang Bumrung's mine was vast. Three bridges were suspended across the mine and lines of miners continuously ferried tin ore out of the mine.

Traditionally, the miners would wash the ore in a running stream. But here, the king noticed that three mechanical

pumps were used to help to wash the ore, each of them costing about 2,600 dollars.

Apparently, there were 62 large mines and 69 smaller mines operating on the island around the time of the king's visit. The mines employed a total of 8,984 workers. During the late 19th century, an industry operating on such a scale was considered remarkable, and it shows how important the mining industry really was in Phuket.

The king's procession moved on to the market place in Phuket Town. Buildings lined both sides of the small road that led through the market. The town was packed with people hoping to catch a glimpse of their monarch on this very auspicious occasion. The king com-

pares the bustling market, filled with food stalls, to the likes of the Sampaeng market in Bangkok.

He wrote, "We do not need a lengthy description. It is very much like our Sampaeng market in Bangkok." But the goods, furniture and fabrics that were on sale were less varied than expected, probably due to the royal visit. The streets would most likely have been cleared of vending carts and stalls, and beautified with large red plants prior to the king's arrival.

Captain Weber rode a horse at the head of the king's procession. Four Chinese policemen also rode in front of the king's chariot. Soldiers guarded the chariot's sides and rear.

Along the roadside, guards and policemen, armed with rifles, were there to enforce security. The king's procession ended at the government office, which was the administrative center of the province.




King Chulalongkorn in full coronation attire earlier in his reign.

King Chulalongkorn had to cancel a visit to Wat Mongkol Nimit on Dibuk Road due to lack of time, though the king did authorize refurbishment of some of the temple's deteriorating buildings.

The king remarked that Phuket Town was large and developed; very different from what he'd witnessed on his previous visit 19 years earlier.

King Chulalongkorn was back at Saphan Hin port by the evening. Guns were fired in salute to the departing monarch. The Indian port administrator, Luang Laxmana, escorted the king and his party back to their yacht.

Although the king's visit was brief, it seemed apparent from his writings that he had been impressed by many aspects of the island, its development and its people. The people of Phuket would have been highly honored to welcome him.





More memoirs by Clive James

live James became rich and famous from his first memoir, Unreli able Memoirs, a hilarious account of his childhood in Australia during the 1950s. He followed this up with two equally funny novels, firstly about his early years in London in Falling Towards England, and then on his academic career in Cambridge in May Week was in June.

He is a supremely facile writer, incapable of a dull sentence, and also a fast one – a talent he would need when, newly married, he embarked on a career as a freelance writer.

James has written four nov-

els; three collections of poetry, a travel book and 15 volumes of criticism, the most recent being Cultural Amnesia, a giant collection of essays on the great thinkers and doers of Western civili-

Now, alas, he has come a cropper with his fourth volume of memoirs, North Face of Soho which is about the decade he spent in London after he left university and got married.

"Even I could see that the first consequence of getting married was the necessity to earn a living," he writes. "Until then, I had lived as a student, which is another way of saying that I had lived like a bum."

Clive tells the reader up front that he has no intention of telling tales about his wife and two daughters. So we are left with a hodgepodge of comical profiles about various editors, writers, theater and movie people. He's funny of, course, but the fluffy tone becomes cloying: like a seven course meal of cotton

The bons mots fly apace. Famed theater critic Kenneth Tynan tells James that he should ater critic. "When I asked him if he could really, truly, still stand the


ery time the curtain goes up.' And I said, 'I get a thrill every time it goes down."

He had risen to TV host by the time he met the eccentric comedian and goon Spike Milligan: "I remember him pretending to be a hotel reception desk in Scotland, complete with ringing bell. The number got started when he found a bell left over from somebody else's sketch. By the time it was finished he was the whole hotel. In the control galley we were falling about to the full extent that space permitted and when the tape finally rolled, we

asked him to do the number again but he had forgotten it. That was the way he was. You have to imagine an illuminated manu-

About TV comic duo theater, he said, 'I get a thrill ev- Russell Harty and Janet Street-



Porter, he writes: "They were the ideal couple. Harty looked and sounded like an aesthete who knew Alan Bennett quite well, and Janet looked and sounded like a cockney female assassin who had been trained to kill with her voice, which was not only raucous but seemed permanently surprised, like a macaw taking off repeatedly from a steam catapult."

There's also a solid bit of literary criticism. Clive James is a great admirer of George Orwell; not only his politics but his prose. When he was fighting in the Spanish Civil War, Orwell's central belief was that it wasn't enough to be against the Nazis, you had to be anti-totalitarian, which meant being against the Communists as well.

"No fan of capitalism myself – there had to be something easier than working for a living -I had nevertheless been raised in a house where that central belief of his didn't need to be stated, so when I read him at length, it was like a long verification of what I had always felt. My mother and father, both of them prime examples of the suffering proletariat of the 1930s, would have left me a Communist heritage if they had thought that there was anything

So yes, there are brilliant bits in this book, but I'm not looking forward to reading more of his memoirs, especially as he becomes rich as a TV presenter.

Much ado about "do

s it correct to say, "Let's do go to town today" - or any thing else beginning with "Let's do" and then a verb? Obviously, the 'do' isn't needed. Thomas Armbrecht Madison, Wisconsin

Barbara replies: "Do" is a remarkably handy little word with many jobs to, um, do. One of these is adding emphasis its function in your example sentence, which is perfectly correct. Nonetheless, you're right to wonder whether the "do" there is redundant with the main verb, "go." "Let's do" can be a complete thought, after all, and in this case it would mean the same thing as "Let's go to town."

But your "do" is no more redundant than the extra "very" in "I'm very, very eager to go to town today." The general meaning would be the same without it, but the tone would change. Sometimes such words are useless or even counterproductive, throwing the tone off – but sometimes they serve a purpose. We word-lovers should keep in mind something Mae West said: "Too much of a good thing can be wonderful."



is 'reticent to comment' is redundant. I would also think that saying someone is 'reticent' to go somewhere or do something makes no sense, since the word pertains only to speech. Am I correct?"

Barbara replies: Today seems to be the day for redundancy questions. Your point of view is certainly the traditional one – for good reason. As the New Oxford American Dictionary explains,



"reticent" comes from the Latin prefix "re- (expressing intensive force)" plus the verb "tacere 'be silent." Etymologically, the word is about keeping quiet.

The New Oxford American is, however, the only one of five major American and Canadian dictionaries to agree with you completely. All of the others give definitions that include words like "restrained" and "understated," and two say "reluctant" is a syn-

In fact, "reticent" and "reluctant" overlap in meaning. Consider this sentence from a Washington Post last year: "Many partners in Facebook's Beacon seem reticent to address the raging privacy controversy surrounding the ad program, resorting to terse, vague statements or opting for outright silence when asked for comment."

Here "reluctant" could be substituted for "reticent," and "address" means something very like the "comment" you object to. But still, "reticent to address" is hard to fault, because the sense of the phrase is "restrained about speaking."

The word is truly wrong only where "reticent" alone would convey the same meaning or where there's no sense of keeping quiet – as in your examples of someone's being "reticent" to go somewhere or do something.

hat exactly does 'first-generation' mean? Is it the per son who came over to this country [the USA] from elsewhere, or the child of that person who is in the first generation born in this country?"

Barbara replies: Annoyingly enough, both of those uses are considered correct. Wondering which meaning was the original one, I looked up "first-generation" in the older dictionaries in my library. The earliest to include the term at all, from the 1960s, gives both of them.

A brave new world?

The election of Democrat Party leader Abhisit Vejjajiva as Prime Minister on December 15 is a welcome and much-needed development, coming at the end of a year marked by the global economic downturn, unprecedented political division and nervousness about prospects for the national economy.

Abhisit, whose appointment was still awaiting royal endorsement as the Gazette went to press, will face huge challenges in healing the rifts of a nation sharply divided along class and regional lines.

Many have noted that given the tenuous state of the global economy, the task facing Abhisit is even more daunting than that of his mentor Chuan Leekpai, who inherited the financial mess left in the wake of the 1997 financial crisis.

It is of course a cliché to say that "politics makes for strange bedfellows", but Abhisit's rise to the nation's top political job through the defection to the Democrat fold of Newin Chidchob and 37 members of his Isarn-based "Friends of Newin" political faction is a stunning development, even by Thai political standards.

For years, Newin, as ex-Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra's right-hand man, was perhaps the most despised national political figure among people in Phuket.

It was Newin who led the no-confidence debate that resulted in the downfall of the first Chuan-led Democrat Party administration

Much of his ammunition came from Phuket itself, where some of the island's most prominent families – including those of two current MPs - were found to have been awarded SorPorKor land use documents intended for landless farmers. Some of these cases remain buried in the court system to this day, well over a decade after the initial scandal broke.

Newin's local foes also include some real farmers, 200 of whom gathered at Phuket Provincial Hall one day in July 2003 after hearing a rumor that Newin, then the Deputy Agriculture Minister, was coming to visit. They wanted to vent their anger at what they believed to be unfair politically motivated mistreatment by state officials directed

With so much animosity between Newin and Phuket, it will be interesting to see what kind of reception he receives from his new island-based "allies" in parliament.

If they really can all sit down and work together after all that has transpired, it will no doubt be a sign of hope for better things to come in the approaching New Year – a year that, even without the political turmoil, is going to sorely try most of the world's governments due to the global economic downturn.



They keep talking about taking the sleaze out of Patong. Is this what they want to replace it with?



2004 tsunami remembered



im Newport is a Phuket-based writer, whose publications include "The Vampire of Siam" trilogy and *Chasing Jimi*. Jim has been a resident of Kamala for more than 15 years, in which time he has worked as a production designer on the Hollywood hit movie starring Nicholas Cage, *Bangkok Dangerous* and also the TV series *LOST*. Jim was on the island during the 2004 tsunami. The things Jim saw and experienced as the tragedy unfolded at a time when many visitors to the island were on holiday and celebrating Christmas, prompted him to write the following poem, which has never before been published.

December 26, 2004:

t sunset, like clock work, in the old days, the buffalos used to come down to the beach and bathe. They'd fill the sand and little children would run between their legs, delighted to see them.

These magnificent beasts with their gently curved horns and large sweet eyes, have all but disappeared from the island. Without work, they lost their purpose. They used to pull the plows that tended the rice paddies. Rice paddies on Phuket today are few and far between. If you find one, there's bound to be a foreign real estate agent negotiating with the farmer for his land.

Most of the water buffalos have been turned into those little meat balls you see sold on tiny skewers and served with noodle soup.

Do I have to pay pension tax in Thailand?

in Thailand on my pension

Svenn-Ove Jakobsen, Consular Officer, Royal Norwegian Embassy, Bangkok replies:

The Thai and Norwegian governments have an agreement regarding payment of pension taxes but the information concerned is quite complex.

The easiest way to find out more is to contact the tax office

in your home town in Norway and ask them to explain, if required, the process through which you can make payments and who to contact to begin the initial setup.

It is also possible to use a lawyer to deal with income tax payments, but, naturally, this will entail additional costs. Finally, you can research the issue yourself by going online and searching the internet for information.

to the world leader in computer software. The company is on a crash schedule to deliver a replacement. Windows 7 is expected to be widely available in less than a year (mid- to late 2009), but persons familiar with MS (including Phuket's own Woody Leonhard) expect that Win7 will feature only minor changes from the latest Vista (SP-1). Is it time to consider the alternatives? There are quite a few, notably the Apple and Linux, but also including less wellknown operating systems such as Solaris, BeOS and others. Note that we are talking about operating systems, the core software that makes the computer work.


Self-appointed savior

The self-appointed "alternative to Microsoft" is Apple. And a very respectable alternative it is, from one of the real founders of the personal computer industry. Apple has been delivering PC systems (integrated hardware and software) since 1975. The company has had major ups and downs, rarely exceeding 10% of the computer market, and sinking well below that in the past few

Apple has had particular success in graphics applications, and has garnered a hardcore group of fanatical Mac fans.

Two major developments in the past decade have earned Apple plaudits from serious computer users. The first was the introduction of the OSX operating system; the second, a change to industry-standard hardware based on Intel processors. The melding of the two has resulted in a powerful computer at a purchase price that is only about 10-20 percent higher than a comparable MS computer. Note the emphasis on purchase price, because, unlike MS, Apple charges full price for point upgrades (equivalent to service packs in MS products) of the operating system. Over a five-year service life this payment for upgrades (required to maintain system functionality and security) will cost

about US\$600 for the Mac, versus less than US\$150 for MS.

The OSX is an excellent operating system, arguably superior in design and usability to the MS products. And so it should be, with a system design based on the highly lauded BSD system, which in turn was an evolutionary derivation from the Unix system that is the fountainhead of almost all modern mainframe computers. The result is a proven design with a modular architecture operating on a very limited choice of Apple hardware devices. This is a sure formula for reliability and "nohassle" (actually, relatively lowhassle) computing. But these features are offset in very large part by the cost, and even more by the limited choice of application software, and by the need to run Apple-approved hardware.

You are currently using Linux

Surprised? Few people other than computer industry professionals and enthusiasts are aware that Linux is the prevalent operating system for the network routers, switches and servers that make up the highly complex worldwide internet. Nobody has counted the number of such units, but it is certainly a goodly share of the more than a billion computers currently in operation.

Google maintains the world's largest distributed computing system, with thousands of computers in each of its huge "server farms". The exact number and location of such farms is around the world. a closely held secret, but with over 60% (some claim a much higher number) of all internet searches it is highly likely that each and every computer user gets a major bite of Linux every

All right, you may say, but Linux is a techie-niche product, not really usable for the ordinary home or office. Microsoft would certainly like to have you believe just that, much as Apple would like to have you believe that Windows is a complicated, insecure mess and that having an Apple every day will greatly increase your computing health. Both notions are very much exaggerated and can lead to large, unnecessary expense.

The techie complexity angle was probably valid up to about five years ago. But the same could be said for earlier versions of Windows. During the past three years a major thrust for Linux development has focused on the user experience, including installation, clear and attractive GUI (graphical user interface) and device drivers.

A major Linux innovation is the Live CD – simply the entire OS and many application programs completely contained on a bootable CD, literally a "try before you buy" road test on your computer. If you like like it, just click an icon to permanently install it, either as the sole operating system or dual-boot alternative which allows you to select the OS to use (either Windows or Linux) each time you boot up the computer.

Did I say try before you buy? Can you do this with Windows or Apple?

A major attraction of Linux is the price: it's free, with free updates and upgrades. No strings attached; free as in "free beer".

Originally developed by computer geeks, students and enthusiasts, Linux is developed and supported by thousands (millions) of such geeks/enthusiasts

There are several companies that have developed a strong market for commercial support for Linux users. Red Hat and Novell are well known and profitable, providing services to companies and government agencies around the world. Many, probably most, private users find that the support available at user groups and forums is at least as adequate as that provided by the help desks at Microsoft and Apple.

The "free" goes beyond the operating system, and includes the applications installed and actually used by almost all users.

Do you use MS Office?

Try Open Office v.3, which includes word processing, spreadsheet, presentation, database and other programs that are great replacements for the MS product and will read/write compatible data files. The Gimp is a great graphics/drawing program; Cinderella for video authoring; GNU Cash for personal finance; Evolution for email ... it goes on and on. Again, try before you buy, and free if you keep it. But few of the most popular computer games will run on Linux, although superb versions of classical games (chess, solitaire, etc) are freely available.

Linux security is legendary, due in large part to the basic architecture and limited access provided by the system design. Apple has made much of this aspect, as it rightly should. It is the same in Linux because they are branches of the same tree. Perfect security is not attainable, and the operator will remain the weakest link in the security chain, but Linux does a great job on the system. Security updates are occasionally needed and are typically posted within days and even hours of discovery.

There is not really one Linux OS, but rather many distributions (distros) that will include the Linux kernel (core operating modules and drivers) and a collection of supporting modules and scripts that will vary considerably between the major distro groups such as Debian, RedHat, SUSE, Gentoo, Puppy, etc. These distro groups will generally include subgoups, such as Ubuntu and Sidux for Debian, Centos and Fedora for RedHat, etc. The free nature of Linux includes a licensing system that allows full use of the code by anybody, but does require that such users include full source code for any additions or changes included in the resulting distro. So, use it, improve it if you wish, and pass it on.

The ultimate solution?

There is no perfect computer system (hardware and software) suitable for everybody. Microsoft tries to please all by including a multiplicity of services, functions and features that try to anticipate the possible use by a lab technician, office worker, commuting executive, front-line military user, home-keeper, child or student.

And make it work on about any personal or business computer with any conceivable hardware device attached. And then support this usability to be backward compatible with obsolete computer systems. A Herculean task, even for a company with enormous resources, and all too often strained and dysfunctional.

Apple has a much more focused approach, delivering a proven modular operating system that is designed to work with a limited pre-approved set of hardware. Linux takes a similar approach but carries it further by enabling it to function on most hardware, including older computers.

Our advice: give these alternatives a try, preferably with a live CD if available, and buy the system that suits your actual needs. They will probably be best served with a low-cost computing solution.

Anyone for cricket?







Asian cricket, powerhouses India and Pakistan come to mind more readily than Thailand. While colonialism might have

CRICKET: When you think of sown the seeds of fanaticism for cricket in these countries a long time ago, the influx of foreigners into Phuket has seen interest in the game slowly increase.

The 2009 Island Furniture Cricket League (IFCL) gets underway in January here in Phuket. The league, which consists of five 11-a-side teams, is now in its fourth year and operates under the auspices of the Phuket Cricket Union (PCU), the governing body for cricket in southern Thailand.

While this may sound quite structured, according to Richard Brown, the Honorary Secretary of the PCU, the IFCL is, first and foremost, about fun.

"We have players ranging in age from teenagers to guys in their 50s. Fitness and ability may vary but everyone enjoys themselves and it's always a really good day out," he said.

Cricket, even in the shortest form of the game, is more of a marathon than a sprint and in the IFCL, matches are contested over an innings of 35 overs per side. The games, which commence at 9 am on a Sunday, can last for up to six hours.

While cricket in Phuket has come a long way since the inception of the PCU, one element is still lacking, as Richard explained. "We still don't have our own ground and it is something we have been searching for for five or six years. We currently play at the Cherng Talay School, but it's a football pitch, not a cricket

"There's no square but what we do is roll the center of the ground to get it as hard and as

flat as possible and then lay a mat specifically designed for cricket, which we get from the Cricket Association of Thailand in Bangkok. Getting our own ground remains our holy grail though," he added.

Cricket's popularity is largely restricted to certain corners of the world and according to Richard the majority of participants in the league come from the former Commonwealth of Great Britain. "The league is made up mostly of expats from traditional cricketing nations like England, New Zealand, Australia and South Africa. There's also a big Indian contingent and we have two Indian teams," Richard told the Gazette.

Fun first and foremost, but make no mistake, all the teams play to win. "Each team plays each other twice in a round robin format, with the top two teams contesting a grand final. Last year's winning side was the Island Cricket Club. It can get competitive but is always played in the right spirit and we normally have a few beers and a BBQ afterwards," he said.

"This has been primarily


through our scholarship program, which is run in conjunction with the Asia Center Foundation. We currently have 126 kids in the program and each year we raise funds at the Phuket 10s."

Singing the praises of sa-tinky sator

sincerely hope my breath doesn't smell. I honestly don't think it does, but you never really know, do you? You can breathe into your hand and inhale whatever is produced, Mr Bean-style, but in reality that doesn't really give you much of a clue. The only guaranteed result is that you'll make a complete prat of yourself.

Even if someone in your vicinity does emit the kind of mouth odors that could strip paint off walls, most of us (even me, believe it or not) are usually way too polite and reserved to point out the reality of their gob-horrors to them. Bert – tactful? I can be polite sometimes. It just doesn't happen very often.

Perhaps members of the fairer sex are the most difficult to deal with on the cesspit-breath front. They can be intelligent, attractive, immensely well endowed and possess numerous other attributes. Beauty can hide a great many things, but it's totally unable to mask the reality of bad breath. Sweet nothings whispered late at night into one's ear aren't nearly so sweet when they smell like the back of a Phuket Municipality garbage

You have to wonder, "How can she not know?" when the lovely lady has breath that would glow in a brightly lit room. There's really no way to handle a situation such as this. You could try the old "I've got some chewing gum - would you like a stick?" approach, but the outlook isn't particularly good, in reality. There's always the high-tech option - refer her to www.badbreathogram.com. Yes, it really does exist. Discreet, but hardly subtle.

If that fails, about the only possibility left would be "I've got a spare toothbrush, some dental floss, industrial toothpicks and a bottle of Listerine... how about giving them a try?" Perhaps wearing an army-issue full-face gas mask when out enjoying her company would also send out the not-so-gentle hint that something may well be amiss.

Food is hugely important in determining whether or not your exhalations cause those around you to recoil in shock. Garlic is a prime culprit, though the symptoms don't seem to last that long,

and the actual ingestion of the stuff is inevitably rather pleasant, so who cares. It's strange - you can genuinely say to someone, "You were certainly on the garlic last night" without causing the least offense, but, "You've got a severe case of botty-breath" may not go down as well, for some inexplicable reason.

In comparison to rather limp-wristed garlic, sator is demonic in its bad-breath inducing abilities. It can reduce people to talk back-to-back rather than face each other – it's powerful stuff. So what is sator? You've seen it all over the place, in markets and at the side of the road – it's that giant, twisty, string-beanlike vegetable that's in season at the moment.

Normally when I attempt to

identify a plant in this column, I give its name in English, followed by the equivalent in Thai in italics. This week's plant leaves us with a bit of a conundrum. The sator is the same in both English and Thai as far as I can make out, but it's a bit difficult to work out which came first. That's why they pay editors huge amounts of money to make italic decisions, I suppose.

The scientific name for the plant is easy: parkia speciosa, and in many parts of the world it's known as petai or parkia. It's sometimes referred to as "twisted cluster bean" or "stink bean". Whoever came up with the last one had his head screwed on straight - it's spot on. As unimaginative as it may be, the sator couldn't really be called anything else.

It's a long, flat bean with bright green seeds the size and shape of plump almonds. The seeds have a rather peculiar smell, to say the least. They are most definitely an acquired taste, but are popular all over southern Thailand and Malaysia. They are usually sold in bunches, still in the pod, or the seeds are sold in plastic bags. They are exported in jars or cans, pickled in brine.

When they're young, the pods are flat because the seeds haven't yet developed, and they hang like a bunch of pale green, almost translucent, slightly twisted ribbons. At this stage you can eat them raw, fried or pickled. If you want to, of course.

Once sator is mature and bears its beans and seeds, they're harvested for cooking. Cooking sator is an art. It's best when combined with other strong-flavored foods such as garlic, chilies and dried shrimp, or added to local dishes such as green curry. Apparently, the seeds are still edible even if they contain worms

They aren't the easiest of trees to grow, unfortunately. These things take a lot of patience, as they take years to ma- bert@bloominbert.com.

ture. They are fairly common in Phuket, but it's not often that you see a young sator tree. It may well be that they simply don't make their intentions clear until later on – the vegetable it produces (technically a fruit, if you want to get anal) can take 10 years to appear for the first time.

In theory, you should be able to germinate the seeds and then plant them to produce a fresh tree. If anyone wants to try this for themselves, please let me know the results in about 10 years' time.

Plant one of these in your garden and you'll need to guard it well. The only reason the examples in the picture have lasted so long is that they're straight out of a third floor apartment. The Thai inhabitants are currently scheming ways of retrieving it.

I actually enjoy the taste of sator, believe it or not. I'm less enthusiastic about the fact that I can still taste it, in a somewhat altered and exaggerated state, over 24 hours later, when the effects are significantly less pleas-

I was discussing the delights of sator with a house guest from Malaysia recently. The first thing she said about the plant's qualities is that "it makes your pee smell". Additionally, she said, it acts as a kidney cleanser, and filters them out. She also swears that aubergine gets rid of the smell. She didn't explain if these theories were linked.

We may well have found the smelliest plant in town; difficult to imagine why we actually eat the stuff. But as we do, maybe we could add a whole new page to www.badbreathogram.com. Sator does, after all, sa-tink. Perhaps every single inhabitant of Phuket should consume this stuff simultaneously. Problem solved – we'd all stink together. Happy munching. Anyone got some extra strong mints?

Let us spray

his week, let's begin with a chore that's familiar to most of us here in the Land of Smiles: repairing a leaky bathroom sprayer.

Before you start, you are going to need the following items: wire brush, adjustable wrench, roll of silicone tape, silicone windshield sealant, dry rags, new rubber washers (or new hose/sprayer assembly), six rubber bands, a few cotton swabs and a cutter.

The sprayers available here have several drawbacks: the base that mates with the hose is often not flat/true, causing an inaccurate seal with the washer beneath it; the hose may have an inadequate flange (which is where a metal tube flares out like the bell of a trumpet) on the metal piece that mates with the spray head; and, worst of all, the fitting which holds the hose against the bottom of the spray-head is typically made of weak, 'chrome'-plated plastic instead of metal.

Most leaks at the sprayer/hose joint occur because the washer inside has become worn, both from long-term compression and from flexing of the hose in the course of normal use.

Another cause is cracking of the plastic fitting, usually from dropping the sprayer. Fixing the first type of leak requires replac-

his week, let's begin with a chore that's familiar to quires replacing the hose as well.

Before carrying out any plumbing repairs, turn off the house's water supply. Failure to do this will result in an impromptu

shower (and a severe test of your sense of humor). Newer houses, however, may have separate kitchen and bathroom turn-off valves. Older houses have one valve, usually right next to the water meter near the street. After turning off the water,

open a bathroom faucet to relieve pressure in the line.

First, unscrew the spray head from the hose's fitting. A word of caution: as mentioned, these fittings are made of plastic and break easily. Even too much grip pressure can crack them, making it necessary to replace the whole hose assembly, since the fittings are installed at the factory before the flange is created and can't come off the hose. Using tools on plastic fittings will almost certainly crack them, and is definitely not advised.



First, dry the fitting, then take half-a-dozen rubber bands and place them, doubled so they fit tightly, over the sprayer and onto the fitting. This will allow a slip-free grip, and help avoid cracking it by gripping too tightly. Turn the sprayer counter-clockwise until it comes off.

Tilt the hose downwards to drain it, then slide the fitting down

away from the end and, voila, one can see the tired old rubber washer. A few tricks here will help ensure a water-tight repair the first time, as doing a job twice is quite irritating. First, check the bottom of the sprayer, where it presses against the washer.

If it is rough or uneven, use a flat, fine-tooth file, or a kitchen-knife sharpening stone to lightly file the face of the opening until it is smooth, even and flat before reassembling everything.

Next, dry the hose-end's flange. Hold the end of the silicone tape against the side of the metal fitting and wrap one turn around it, keeping the tape straight from the roll, but not stretching it. Holding the hose in the left hand, wrap counter-clockwise, coming over the top of the hose towards you. This is important, since if tape is wrapped clockwise, tightening the fitting will loosen it. Then, on the remaining turns, pull on the roll a little harder, stretching the tape slightly. This tape is extremely thin, so don't pull too hard. Wrap in a spiral towards the flange, with the last two or three turns half on the hose and half on the back of the flange. Cut the tape when done, don't pull till it breaks. Try to use no more than five or six turns in total, or else the fitting won't secure onto the sprayer

Next, spread silicone sealant liberally on both sides of the washer, and a little into the threads on the bottom of the sprayer as well (the smell fades




after drying). A useful tip: use cotton swabs as easily disposable spreading tools. Then, holding the hose upright, slowly slide the fitting back up over the flange, rotating it counter-clockwise to slip over the tape without loosening it. Now, gently position the washer in place. Next, grip the fitting firmly, carefully insert the sprayer, and tighten by turning the sprayer in a clockwise direction, making sure the threads start correctly. If the fitting won't snug up to the flange, you've used too much silicone tape and will have to take off the sprayer and remove a turn. Tighten the sprayhead until it stops, then torque it only about another eighth of a turn, and that should do it. Don't over tighten!

If also replacing the hose, install the sprayer onto the hose first (following the above steps, as even new parts can leak), as it is easier to do with the hose unattached to the wall, then attach the hose to the water outlet. If the water outlet pipe is metal, it may need to be cleaned with a wire brush before attaching the new hose. Wire-brush the threads thoroughly, getting down in the

bottom of each groove, wipe them clean with a damp rag, dry them, then smear sealant into the threads, or use the silicone tape, wrapping in the direction the fitting will turn when tightening. Tape the flanged metal piece at the hose end as discussed above, coat the washer with sealant, insert, and attach the hose's fitting to the water pipe. If the water pipe is PVC (plastic), just clean the threads with a slightly damp rag, dry, then use the sealant or tape. The hose's fitting that attaches to the water pipe is usually metal, so a wrench can be used to tighten it, but again, don't overdo it as this can distort the washer and cause leakage. Don't over torque; tighten until snug, then just an eighth-turn more. That should do it.

Tips: when lifting the sprayer out of the wall bracket, grip the hose beneath the sprayer and lift, then grasp the sprayer for use. Also, try to avoid twisting or bending the sprayer at extreme angles to the hose. This will ensure the longevity of the washer. Happy spraying!
