

Power lines to go underground

PHUKET CITY: A decades-old plan to bury electric cables in the heart of Old Phuket Town took a big step forward on December 22 when the Provincial Electrical Authority (PEA) and Phuket City Municipality signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) to provide over 10 million baht in funding for the project.

Phuket City mayor Somjai Suwanasupana said the signing of the MOU followed a lengthy public hearing process, during which over 100 local property owners were consulted.

A primary concern of property owners in the project area was that the vibration from the construction work might cause damage to the old buildings. These fears were allayed when they were shown detailed plans of how the work would be carried out under the main road, with minimal impact on existing struc-

Cables have already been successfully laid along Soi Romanee, which runs off Thalang Rd, with co-operation from local agencies and property owners. Soi Romanee, reputedly home to a row of Chinese brothels during Phuket's tin mining days, is now host to a number of tourist-related businesses.

The project will involve moving electric power and tele-

phone cables into conduit piping beneath the surface of Thalang Road, famous for its Sino-Portuguese style shophouses.

Attractive streetlights will also be installed as part of the project, intended to improve the appearance along the main stretch of one of Phuket City's most famous tourist areas – for many years the center of the island's retail trade.

Kriangsak Chuchartpong, a director of the Phuket City Municipality told the Gazette, "The Electricity Authority will organize more than 300 meters of underground cable to be laid along Thalang Road, starting at the Thepkrasattri intersection down to the Yaowarat-Thalang intersection."

Mr Kriangsak added that agencies will have the opportunity to bid for construction rights. Work will begin around the end of February and will take approximately six months to complete. Of the total project budget of just under 11 million baht, the PEA will invest the lion's share of 8.6 million baht.

Additional funding of almost 5.0 million baht from the municipality includes about 2.6 million baht for the installation of streetlights.

The city also hopes to expand the project to other parts of Old Phuket Town, including Krabi Road, Yaowarat Road and Dibuk Road.



Extra police and volunteers on patrol

PHUKET: Amid hopes that the new year will see a large influx of tourists to the island, the Phuket Provincial Police held a ceremony on Soi Bangla on the night of December 29.

Beginning at 7 pm, rows of law officers including those from Kathu Police, the Highway Police, Marine Police and Tourist Police and volunteers were joined

by emergency medical workers two checkpoints manned by Phuket Provincial Police Commander Apirak Hongtong

As in the three previous years, checkpoints – both on roads and in walking areas - will play a prominent role in the crime suppression effort.

In addition to the nine major checkpoints set up by the Provincial Police, there will also be

in listening to an address by Highway Police officers in the north of the island.

> Phuket Highway Police chief Jittapol Kessarak said the checkpoints will be manned around the clock from December 30 until January 5, offering refreshments to motorists. They will also have mechanics, ambulances and fire-fighting equipment ready for emergencies.

PHUKET CITY: The Phuket Provincial Police have unveiled a new campaign aimed at reducing crime during the high season.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Apirak Hongtong announced the campaign at a press conference at Phuket City Police Station on December 24.

Citing the global economic downturn, problems in the Thai economy, the unstable political situation and the recent release of a large number of inmates from Phuket prisons, Maj Gen Apirak warned of possible increased criminal activity on the island. He urged police to step up patrols and investigations in their attempts to curb crime in Phuket.

Tourists come to Phuket with a positive outlook, but need to remain vigilant. Some criminals might target foreigners, such as in the tragic murder of Swedish tourist Hanna Backlund in Mai Khao in March this year, he said.

While that case created headlines around the world, Maj Gen Apirak believes that such violent crimes are now very unlikely because police have been

extremely active in crime suppression activities and checkpoints are in operation all over the island with the high season underway.

Maj Gen Apirak assured the public that local police chiefs who fail to control crime in their districts would face severe punishment, including possible transfer.

In addressing the issue of crime by foreigners, police will continue to co-ordinate with embassies, foreign police and Interpol in gathering intelligence on known criminals via the internet. Police will investigate all criminal behavior, including that of billionaires and influential figures if necessary, said Maj Gen Apirak.

With rapid growth in the local property market, landowners who encroach on government land will also be arrested and prosecuted, he added.

The Justice Department's Department of Special Investigation (DSI) is now working closely with Phuket City Police in investigating a number of alleged encroachment cases in the district, he revealed.

Police Blotter

Phuket Provincial Police crime statistics January – November

Murder: There were 84 reports of murder (+23.0% year-on-year) with 40 arrests.

Manslaughter: There were 320 reports of manslaughter (-1.5% year-on-year) with 186 arrests.

Theft: There were 760 reports of theft (+0.1% year-on-year) with 469 arrests. Reports of bike theft stood at 62 (-49.2% year-on-year) with 35 arrests. Reports of fraud and embezzlement numbered 293 with 44 arrests.

Gambling: Statistics are divided into two categories: general gambling and illegal lottery. There were 649 cases of general gambling resulting in 2,098 arrests (-4.4% year-on-year). 307 people were arrested in connection with the illegal lottery (-5.8% year-on-year).

Drugs: Arrests stood at 1,410 (+26.5% year-on-year), out of a total of 1,233 cases. Drug seizures for November were as follows:

Dry marijuana: 92.33 grams.

Krathom (Mitragyna Speciosa): 163 leaves, 0.25 liters of extract.

Ya bah (methamphetamine): 2,587 pills.

Ya ice (crystal methamphetamine): 296.58 grams.

Alprazolam (Xanax): 350 pills.

Teenage gun crime victim recovering

KOH KAEW, PHUKET: A 16-year-old male is being treated for gunshot wounds at Vachira Phuket Hospital.

The boy was shot in the chest and right arm in the early hours of December 28, a local Thai-language newspaper has reported. Phuket City Police received a 191 report of the shooting at about 2 am.

By the time police arrived at the scene, at the intersection of Thepkrasattri Rd and the Sapam-Samkong Rd, the victim had already been rushed to hospital.

They found the young man's motorcycle lying in the middle of the road, surrounded by onlookers.

Police questioned another youth at the scene who identified himself as a friend of the victim.

The friend told police that he had rushed to the scene after hearing about the shooting from his girlfriend, who was carrying a mobile phone.

The youths had all been out together that night and after eating noodle soup had just split up to return home, he said.

The victim left on a motorcycle with another friend, who might be able to tell police who had carried out the attack, the youth added.

Assigned to investigate the shooting was Phuket City Inspector for Investigations Wichak Tarom. The lieutenant colonel has been given the nickname "The Magnet" by the local media for his ability to crack tough cases and bring criminals to justice.

Beggars tarnish Phuket's image, says governor

PHUKET CITY: Beggars are out of control and damaging Phuket's image, Governor Preecha Ruangjan said at the monthly meeting of the Phuket Provincial Security Committee at Provincial Hall today.

According to a report by *Manager online*, Gov Preecha

said there were large numbers of beggars working a range of areas, including markets, temples and beaches.

The governor said he had witnessed the problem with his own eyes many times.

As beggars irritate both the general population and tourists,

relevant agencies should solve the problem quickly, he added.

At the same meeting, Phuket Provincial Police Station Superintendent Grissak Songmoonnark identified Patong as the most popular area for beggars to target tourists.

Col Grissak, formerly Kathu police superintendent, said beggars there comprise both disabled and able-bodied people.

They work between 5 and 10 pm every day, changing coins in banks when they have collected enough.

Beggars there can earn as much as 3,000 baht per day, depending on the time of year.

Beggars are unafraid of arrest because they always have enough money to pay fines when caught by police, he said.

The beggars go out as a group before dispersing to various points around Patong, returning together to their homes in Phuket City by taxi after their night's work is done, he added.



Singers say 'No' to drugs


No fake notes in Phuket banks

The announcement came following several news reports of fake bank notes in circulation and the Finance Office receiving calls from the public asking how to ensure they are not victims of the forgeries. Many vendors stopped accepting 500- and 1,000 baht notes following the news reports.


A crowd at Loma Park at a merit-making ceremony in the morning.

PHUKET: Four years since the tragic events of December 26, 2004, sad memories of the tsunami still cast their shadow over Phuket. In memory of the more than 300,000 people who lost their lives in the disaster, official events were held on Boxing Day 2008

at Patong, Mai Khao and Kamala beaches as well as at Phuket International Airport.

The ceremony at Patong's Loma Park began with the reading of a letter from Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva. In his message, read by Phuket Governor

Preecha Ruangjan, the prime minister called upon those in attendance to pause and remember the 5,300 people in Thailand who lost their lives or were injured in the disaster.

Prime Minister Abhisit reminded the crowd of the destruc-

tion suffered by the people in the Andaman region – not just to businesses and property, but also to the beaches, coral reefs and other natural resources that make Thailand's Andaman coastline special. Mr Abhisit's letter finished by adding that in the wake of such a disaster lessons must be learned so that the people of the Andaman region will be prepared should another catastrophe strike.

To minimize loss of life and damages from future disasters, the government has designated December 26 as National Disaster Prevention Day. The initiative is not only to remind people of the tsunami dangers, but also to educate people on how to protect themselves from all possible disasters, natural or man-made.


In one of the many activities marking National Disaster Prevention Day, guests and staff

at the Phuket Graceland Resort & Spa in Patong joined members of the general public in donating blood, which will be stored for use in case of any future emergencies.

That evening, dignitaries including Foreign Affairs Minister Kasit Piromya, Gov Preecha, and Phuket Provincial Administration Organization President Paiboon Upatising joined the crowd in laying wreaths and flowers on the beach and lighting candles in memory of those who lost their lives.

Full body massage by a real



Phalo, the wild boar piglet that gives humans full body massages with his snout, giving a lucky client the unique treatment. Phalo is a pampered house pig whose favourite dish is mackerel with

CHIANG MAI: Villagers in Sansai District's Tambon Nong Jom have been rushing to try the services of the village's newest masseuse – a wild boar piglet named Phalo.

In exchange for occasional mackerel or a few sweets, Phalo uses his snout to massage tired limbs – reportedly with as much skill as the most expert human hands.

The unusual talent was discovered by the little boar's owner, 30-year-old Wachareewong Somchai, when he took Phalo to play in the bedroom and the piglet began to use his snout to rub his owner's calves. Mr Wacha-reewong then pointed to other parts of his body and Phalo duly obliged, giving him a complete body massage.

When word spread around the village, neighbours came to try out the piggy masseuse for themselves.

Mr Wachareewong calls

Phalo's name, points to the person and the the piglet starts the treatment. Phalo duly continues until Mr Wachareewong tells him to stop.

The pig came to live with Mr Wachareewong and his wife, 30-year-old Sao Somchai, after Mr Wachareewong found him at a friend's house in Fang District. The friend explained to Mr Wachareewong that Phalo's mother had given birth to a litter of five piglets, but she then trampled four of them to death.

Phalo, also trampled by his clumsy mother, somehow managed to survive. Feeling sorry for the creature, Mr Wachareewong asked his friend if he could take the piglet home. Mr Wachareewong and his wife raised Phalo on baby formula, then weaned him onto solid food.

However, unlike normal boars, Phalo does not like typical pig fare such as rice bran. Rather, he insists on human food. His favourite dish is mackerel with rice.

Also quite strangely, given his species, Phalo does not like playing in the mud – he is a house pig through and through, even sleeping in the same bed as his owners. Phalo, who, incredibly, has never wet the bed, wakes the couple up with his snout to go outside every morning. He also likes to go for rides on the back of his owners' motorcycle.

As Phalo's fame spread, offers started coming in to buy the boar – some for more than 10,000 baht. But Mr Wachareewong and Mrs Sao, who have no children, said that they love Phalo like a child and could never sell him.

Mr Wachareewong said that he believes that in a previous life Phalo was a human and that the two of them must have made merit together so they could be reunited in this life.

Concern growing over counterfeits

Due to rampant forgery, 1,000baht banknotes have literally lost their shine among small-scale vendors across the country. Many have been refusing to accept them, giving the excuse that they do not have enough cash for change.

Somchai Setkornnukool, a senior director at the Bank of Thailand's Northeast Branch, explained that people can distinguish fake notes from authentic ones by differences in texture.

The words "Thai Government" (in Thai language) are embossed on real bills and not on the bogus versions. The difference can be felt with the fingertips, he said. Also, when a real banknote is held against the light, a watermark of His Majesty The King's portrait should become clearly visible.

Another thing to look for are small translucent numerals and letters indicating the value of the banknotes on the metallic color thread, Mr Somchai said. When tilted, numerals showing the values of each 500-baht and 1,000baht note should change color when viewed at different angles, he added.

Printers of fake banknotes are liable to life imprisonment if caught. Deliberately using the fake banknotes, meanwhile, is punishable by a jail term ranging from one to 15 years.

However, vendors risk being punished too if they reject a banknote without verifying whether it is real or fake.

"Banknotes are legal tender for all debts, public and private. If you are not allowed to use your banknotes, you can lodge a complaint with the police," Deputy Metropolitan Police Commissioner Maj-General Amnuay Nimmano said.

Thai Bankers' Association secretary-general Thawatchai Yongkittikhun confirmed that bank customers now asked for 500-, 100- and 20-baht banknotes much more than usual. He said he feared a shortage in smaller denominations might ensue if the trend continues.

Mr Thawatchai called on the authorities to urgently educate people about how to distinguish fake from authentic banknotes. There is "no possibility" of a fake 1,000 baht note being dispensed from an ATM machine, he added.

According to a source at Bangkok Bank, notes with serial numbers starting 9A650 and 2D150 should be examined very carefully.

Animal stem cell warning

Millionaires who undergo animal stem cell therapy to erase wrinkles at beauty clinics or treat diseases could die from sudden cardiovascular system failure, Dr Tanom Bunaprasert of Chulalongkorn University Medical School has warned.

The internet, television and print media are full of advertisements for animal stem cell therapies claiming to give people a more youthful look.

In the belief that such treatment could remove facial wrinkles, people are needlessly paying up to 1 million baht per session. However, the feeling of a younger face and fresher skin is caused by the placebo effect, not the stem cells, Dr Tanom said.

There is no scientifically approved mechanism for animal stem cells to be used in human treatment and animal stem cell therapy is illegal in all developed countries.

Serial injections of animal stem cells into the body cause the immune system to produce antibodies that quickly destroy doses of injected animal stem cells.

Someone injected with animal stem cells who then receives an organ transplant, such as a kidney or liver, will face high risk of rejection and the memory of the immune system to foreign stem cells is lifelong, he added.

Stem cells are not a chemical substance, but just living cells. Such cells only produce benefits while they are alive. The injection of dead stem cells is useless, he explained.

Next step for Nectec

The National Electronics and Computer Technology Center (Nectec) is to be reorganized, changing its role from that of a center for government policy on information and communication technology to become a research and development center with the primary aim of creating new technology platforms to support local industry and government organizations.

Nectec director Pansak Siriruchatanapong said the agency would manage about 16 research and development laboratories working on the development of new technology platforms. These will include sensors, security, knowledge engineering and networking technologies, and nano-electronics.

The goal of the agency will be to build Thailand's capabilities and support the private sector so that businesses will have new technology with which to create new commercial products and services.

Mr Pansak said the reorganization would take place next year. In the process, the agency would create three flagship projects aimed at transforming analog content to a digital format, improving data storage in the healthcare sector and developing new technologies for agriculture under the Agricultural Land Reform Office's Cyber Brain project, he added.

Calls for peace as violence casts a shadow over the Deep South plan

DEEP SOUTH: One day after Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva announced the formation of a civilian-led agency to oversee the situation in the violence-plagued Deep South, insurgents detonated a bomb that injured three security guards for local schoolteachers in Pattani's Sai Buri district on December 23.

The bomb, hidden near a small garden in the school grounds, was set off remotely as the three soldiers came in range. The explosion was the latest incident in a recent upsurge of violence in the region.

The same day in Narathiwat's Chanae district gunmen shot an election campaign staff member of the Chart Thai Pattana Party, injuring him severely.

The shooting took place at 10am on the Ragnae - Chanae road in Lubo Lasoh village, in Tambon Phadungmatra of Chanae District. Hawaetah Tahyeh, 51, was shot three times in the chest and once in the neck by a gunman armed with an AK-47 assault rifle.

part in the election campaign for Niaris Jetapirom, who is contesting a by-election in Narathiwat's Constituency 2. Mr Hawaetah was riding in a pick-up truck, the last in a 15-vehicle campaign procession. The insurgents, also in a pick-up truck, sped past the procession and opened fire at Mr Hawaetah.

Also in Pattani on December 23, an army sub-lieutenant was fatally shot by insurgents in Nongchik district.

Sub-Lt Manoon Waealee, a 50-year-old Muslim, was shot four times by a pillion rider at 8 am while he was riding his motorcycle to work at the Ingkhayuth army base. He died in hospital.

The attacks came one day after Mr Abhisit announced the formation of a new agency to oversee the three southernmost provinces.

The new civilian-led agency, to be directed by a C-10 bureaucrat, will have the power to transfer any government officials from the region.

It is not clear how the already complex security apparatus in the Deep South will align itself under the new agency. Successive Thai governments have provided the military with an overwhelming mandate extendexploded in front of a department store in Pattani at 6:10 pm killing a mother and injuring her two children and five others. The moment of detonation was captured on the store's CCTV camera and widely replayed in the media, along with images of the injured children in hospital.

Police said insurgents hid a five-kilogram home-made bomb inside a motorcycle and parked it in front of the Pattani Supermarket and detonated it with a mobile phone. The dead woman was identified as Suenee Wansulong, aged 35.

Also that day, four people were injured when a bomb exploded in front a hotel in Yala province. Police said the explosion occurred at 6:30 pm in front of the Park View Hotel in downtown Yala and that the 15-kilogram home-made bomb, hidden inside a pick-up truck, only partly detonated, apparently because part of the circuit failed to be ig-

Professor's killers caught

SONGKHLA: Police have arrested two men for the murder of a retired assistant professor from Songkhla Rajabhat University who was strangled in her home December 17.

Rayong natives Somsak Chanduayjit, 39, and Chairat Bunromyen, 22, were arrested in Samut Sakhon two days after the killing of Asst Prof Yindee Sawanakhunanon, aged 60.

Songkhla Provincial Police Commander Wirun Eamphaijit announced the arrest on December 21 and took the two suspects to perform a reenactment of the murder at the victim's house in Tambon Phawong, in Songkhla's Muang District.

Asst Prof Yindee, who retired in September 2008, was found lying dead in her bedroom at approximately 8:30pm. She had been strangled with the strap of her handbag. Police said that the killers made off with the victim's Toyota Altis car, mobile phone and a large amount of jewellery.

Mr Somsak and Mr Chairat were caught after Songkhla police received intelligence that the two suspects were hiding out in Samut Sakhon. They were arrested by local police in that province. Police said that the suspects both confessed to killing Asst Prof Yindee after they had been hired to fix her roof.

Family massacred

SURAT THANI: Police have arrested one suspect after gunmen shot dead the wife, daughter and three-year-old granddaughter of a former member of the Sakhu Tambon Administration Organization in Surat Thani's Phrasaeng District. Police Region 8 Commissioner Santhan Chayanon said on December 25 that Somchai Thawon. 34, had been arrested after witnesses identified him as one of the gunmen.

The shooting took place around 7:30 pm December 22. Witnesses said a pick-up truck pulled up outside the house of Eam Chuangmanee, 43, in Sakhu Village 6. Gunmen then opened fire on the people inside the house with automatic weapons.

Mr Eam was out at the time, but his wife, 42-year-old Sunan Chuangmanee, daughter Prisana Chuangmanee, 21, and granddaughter Sasiwimon Chuangmanee, 3, all died at the scene. Mr Eam's son-in-law, 23year-old Kittiphon Eimduang, was also hit but survived.

Police said that they now believe Mr Kittiphon, rather than his father-in-law, was the target of the attack. Mr Somchai denied involvement in the killings, but did admit that he had an ongoing dispute with Mr Kittiphon over profits from a cock fighting ring, police said.

Tax relief for tourism?



The big talking point for the people of Ao Nang recently was a fire at a local gas station.

n describing this year's high season, newspaper articles are using terms like "gloomy", "unprecedented falls in occupancy", "a write-off", and "desperate". Anecdotal evidence from veteran hoteliers and business owners in Krabi confirms that for most businesses, this is the worst operating environment in history.

While hotels that contract with the large package tours flying directly from Europe to Krabi are faring better, the cutback in service by Thai Air and the uncertain status of Krabi Air do not bode well for future occupancy rates. Many tourists are complaining of an inability to book flights as the cut back in service has left all remaining flights sold out for weeks. Some customers are flying to Phuket or Surat Thani to make it to Krabi. While oil prices have plummeted from \$147 a barrel to less than \$40, airline ticket prices have scarcely decreased.

Some local restaurants and businesses are talking of closing at the beginning of February, or at least reducing staff levels to match the lower turnover rates. The absence of any indications of a rebound has led some to consider shutting down and riding out the long low season to come. Without a profitable high season to bankroll the less profitable months, staying open may not be possible.

Several local hotels have already started cost cutting measures by canceling their Christmas parties. With occupancy at 50% in many of the mid-range hotels for Christmas, it makes little sense to produce a Christmas show with live music and Thai dancing and an expensive buffet. Some resorts have canceled their Christmas parties and arranged to send their guests to the larger resorts. Better to have 3 or 4 fully booked, cost-effective Christmas parties than a dozen or more half-filled events that will lose money.

The interesting question is what will the new government do to help improve business or at least reduce the stress on the tourist industry? The attitude of the tax and revenue department will also have a great influence on the outlook of small business owners. It is no secret that the

tax authorities pay special attention to foreign businesses as a source of tax revenue. Some foreigners feel so hassled they have closed their companies and re-opened in the name of a Thai national to escape scrutiny.

The tax authorities could reduce the burden on small businesses as follows. In July of each year, businesses must file their half-

year tax payment on their total expected income for the year. Most companies were running at a profit in July, but have since incurred huge losses, guaranteeing a large loss for the year. The tax authorities have announced that tax payments on evaporated profit estimates are non-refundable. A nice gesture would be to give these businesses that paid tax at half-year and show a loss for the full year a refund or credit on future tax payments. I won't hold my breath.

Another comment, allegedly made by a tax official, was that the maximum decline in income allowable for this year was 20%. We hope that the new gov-


ernment will re-assess this stance, as most tourist-related businesses are down 50%-70% and would love to have income down just 20%. The last thing struggling small business owners need is to pay tax on imaginary and non-existent income so the local tax authorities can hit their tax revenue budgets.

Others have proposed a reduction or suspension of VAT, but this is not a viable solution and one shouldn't get one's hopes up. This is a macro-economic tool that often faces resistance to its re-implementation when the economy rebounds and is not popular with the central gov-

ernment. What is needed is tax relief targeted at the tourist industry with the aim of helping businesses through a difficult year. The bottom line is that many small to medium businesses will not survive without a supportive role plaved by the central government and tax authorities. Inaction will certainly lead to increased unemployment and social in-

stability. Away from economic woe, the big talking point for the people of Ao Nang was the recent burning down of the local gas station in Ao Nang village. The explosion knocked out the town's power supply for 45 minutes, destroying the gas station and an adjoining restaurant. Three people, including the owner, were injured and transported to Bangkok Phuket Hospital for treatment. The cause of the fire is unclear. There were rumors of a pump malfunction which sparked the fire. Other locals point to the fact that the station was still charging 38 baht/liter while the other stations in the area had dropped

prices down to 20 baht/liter.

white paper, I could see the pungent, pep pery Negroamaro wine inside was something special. "Super-lovely," I noted, "almost black, with a reddish circle round the edge; and what luscious legs! So well defined, and quick to show themselves."

The Negroamaro was one of six glasses presented during a tasting at Chalong Wine Connection centering on the productions of *Umani Ronchi*, a 51-year-old winery, operated by Winemaker Michele Bernetti, in Italy's Marche region.

Rural Marche (pronounced "mar-kay") lies midway along Italy's Adriatic seacoast; Ancona is its chief town; the chief busiagriculture. It shares a northwestern border with Tuscany and a southern with Abruzzi and its winemaking has some affinities with both. But the Marche is largely unknown in international winemaking circles.

"Are there any quality wines made in the Marche?" the celebrated wine writer Andre Simon once asked rhetorically –

"olding my glass against then answered, "None at all."

That was in the early '60s, when Italy's most notable wines were produced in Piedmont and Tuscany. Italy's long east coast was given over to production of local varieties all but unknown outside Italy and of undistinguished character. The eastern regions remain the peninsula's chief bulk producers (although quality is notably better); but with the boom in international wine sales a few vintners are implementing more modern and far better agricultural and vinifying techniques, and putting their wines in attractively labeled 75cl 'quarts' instead of nondescript gallon containers. In this regard, Umani Ronchi has been one of the leaders.

The vintner's vines are in 12 plots, covering 180 hectares in the Marche and 30 in the Abruzzi. As the vineyards were acquired by purchase, the winery has many old vines ranging in age from 30 to 100 years. Viticultural techniques have focused on training the vines up: the traditional Italian method of allowing vines to spread out in long tendones, al-

though still in use, is apparently being abandoned. As a result, Ronchi is the only producer in the Abruzzi with a Denominazione di Origine Controllata e Garantita or DOCG (the highest government-sponsored control certification) rated Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, and has won a best of show award at the International Wine Challenge in

Success has been aided by the market's recent curiosity in local grape varieties, varieties with characters to set them apart from the herd of French varietals mainly Cabernet, Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, Syrah (Shiraz), and Sauvignon Blanc that dominate New World production. Attention has focused especially on the myriad of varietals found in Italy. All are looking for the next Primitivo, a cousin of California's Zinfandel, planted throughout the southern peninsula and Sicily, which has turned from bulk wine non-entity into international star.

Thailand's wine aficionados are especially interested in identifying the next big thing before it is splashed across the wine press's glossy pages. That's because tax on wines is 400 per cent. If we don't find it before others do, it will be too expensive for purchase. Herein Wine Connection finds its raison d'etre. As both importer and retailer, the chain's buyers are ever on the lookout in less looked-in places (whoever heard of the Marche?) for under-priced high-quality

Along with the six wines sampled, Wine Connection's Lyonnais chef Eric Lamiraux, provided hors d'oeuvres consisting of Parma ham, coppa, homemade terrine and rillette (shredded pork loin cooked in pork fat); Brie, Gouda and Danish blue cheeses; onion jam a speciality of the house native to Lyons; and bread: taken together, a satisfying combination with the wines.

Our first glass was a 2007 Trebbiano-Chardonnay blend

(650 baht) from Umani Ronchi's vineyards in the Marche, where the vines are planted in soil thick with clay. Winemaker Bernetti feels this is appropriate for growing white grapes. Certified merely Indicazione Geografica *Tipica* or 'typical of the geography' (IGT), it was light, straw colored, slightly bitter but refreshingly acidulous, and plainly intended as a simple food accompaniment.

Next up was Santa Caterina Winery's 2006 Salento Chardonnay (650 baht), golden winner of the 2007 Medal Chardonnay du Monde. It was an IGT from Apulia (which forms the heel of Italy's boot), another region once known only for bulk wines. 10K-gold colored, pleasantly floral and with a zingy taste, this was another excellent food wine. No trace of oak was evident. Paul Clark, Wine Connection Phuket's general manager, called it a departure from overoaked Australian Chardonnays but there were characteristic flavor notes of citrus and vanilla. It went especially well with the cheeses.

Our third glass was one of Ronchi's DOC wines, this a Classico the 2007 Verdicchio dei Castello di Jesi (980 baht), from vineyards planted 150 - 300 meters high on hillsides around the town of Maiolati Spontini in the Marche. DOC today is the next certification rung below DOCG but for a long period was the highest rating in Italy; 'Classico' indicates it is from the traditional producing region for that grape. It was straw colored, well structured, fruity, rather herbaceous and acidic; the finish had perhaps something of almonds in it a sensible accompaniment to fish dishes.

Then came the aforementioned Negroamaro, a 2005 from Canonico Salento Winery (650 baht), which Paul called a big hit with customers. Negroamaro is typically a dark, plummy wine, big, full and extracted; it produces wines with rich black fruit flavors and high alcohol levels. This was remarkably refined, with no rough edges in the finish, and hints of cherries and licorice in the nose no wonder it won a gold medal at the Concours General Agricole de Paris last year. Excellent.

Equally impressive, perhaps even better, was Umani Ronchi's 2007 Montepulciano d'Abruzzo DOC (650 baht) dark, almost violet, robust, full bodied and tannin rich, it finished cleanly, had thick glycerin 'legs', and traces of licorice in the nose. Spicy, smooth and plush, the wine's flavors opened fully after about 20 minutes, and it lost all trace of youthful bitterness. Good stuff.

Finally, we sampled one of Ronchi's 'flagship' wines, the 2006 Jorio DOC (950 baht). Made from a selection of Montepulciano d'Abruzzo grapes in the Abruzzi, it is aged partly in large oak barrels. The wine is near black with a brownish edge, peppery and potent, in the fullness of youthful vigor, and shows signs of future complexity. It is really too young still to drink without decanting, but after 40 minutes' airing it opened enough to show its finer points. For laying down.







1-2 Bedrooms Starting From 3 Million

Photography inspired by infrared

By Nick Davies

ooking for a way to cap ture his subjects in a dif ferent light, British photographer Martin Reeves discovered that he could achieve stunning results by using infrared-sensitive film. Martin discovered the eerie effects of using film that was first developed during World War I when he was experimenting with artistic photography in the 1980s.

"On my first trip to Asia I took color and infrared film with me but when I developed the photographs that I'd taken I was quite disappointed. I thought I was going to reveal this mystical land, but I couldn't escape from consumerism and Coca Cola, which all came through much too boldly for my liking in the color pictures.

"But when I developed the black and white film it had this old, timeless feel to it," Martin explained.

Since then, Martin has developed his unusual technique – and his own photographs – while living in Bangkok and traveling around Asia. Now he is exhibiting his collection of striking portraits and picturesque scenes of

traditional Thai life at the Banvan Tree Phuket until the end of January.

Martin's collection, entitled "Hidden Realms", is made up of scenes from around Thailand, including Phuket, and focuses on rural life, ancient structures and nature's own geological artwork.

Each of the images seems to glow in its frame and has a dream-like quality to it; the 'mystery' that once escaped Martin's

Martin explained that the infrared-sensitive film captures light that you wouldn't normally see with the naked eye or in a photograph taken with standard

"Working with this kind of film is quite fiddly and it can take a while to take a shot. You can't let any light fall on the roll of film when you take it out of the container. Even if the film is still in the roll, infrared light can get through the felt-lined gap and fog the entire film, so I have to change films in a black bag for complete darkness. I usually have to do this under the blazing sun, which can get very uncomfortable," he explained.

The distinctiveness of

Martin's portraits is not only due to his choice of film, but very much to do with the way he approaches his projects and the people he photographs.

Before taking his camera out of its bag, Martin likes to spend several days in the community that he plans to photograph, which helps his subjects to relax and feel comfortable in front of the lens.


The results are images of everyday folk in very natural yet poignant poses; unafraid, unguarded and unassuming.

In many of his portraits Martin has captured his subject at an emotional peak, illustrating pieces of personal history before the snap of the shutter.

Some seem deep in thought with streaks of worry or frustration lining their faces, while you can see celebration of the joys of a simple life in the eyes of oth-

The Banyan Tree Phuket discovered Martin through the book Thailand: 9 Days in the Kingdom, which was published to celebrate the 80th birthday of His Majesty King Bhumipol Adulyadej, and is available in each of the resort's villas for





guests to enjoy.

The book features Martin's work among that of 55 other esteemed photographers who all took pictures around Thailand in the same nine-day period.

As more and more professional photographers turn to using digital cameras, Martin – for the moment - is a steadfast traditionalist and refuses to convert from using real film.

However, he explained that he will one day be forced to change because manufacture of the infrared film was discontinued by Kodak last year.

'Although I'm reluctant to change, I've got a fridge full of the infrared film, but once that's used up, there will be no more," he said.

Martin added that he had even been in touch with the CEO of Kodak to see if the company would consider making just a



couple of batches a year of the film, as Konica used to, but to no avail.

With the impending extinction of an art form created from a bygone scientific era, it may only be in Martin's "Hidden Realms" that one will be able to experience such a moving insight into days gone by.

The Hidden Realms exhibition is on display at the Banyan Tree Gallery, located in the lobby area of the Banyan Tree Phuket, until January 31. Martin's photographs can be purchased through the shop. Reviving the global economic system will be a painful process

he *Phuket Gazette* erroneously headed my article, Money Talks December 20 -26, "Inflation is the only solution to the crisis". It gave the impression that I thought that inflation was the cure to the current economic problems.

I believe that the wellmeaning soul who devised that headline honestly interpreted the final words of my article which stated, "There is one tried and tested way of reducing massive debt: inflation", to mean that inflation was being recommended as a cure rather than as an old political expedient.

In reality, there is going to be a lot of pain in the curative process of the global economic system, following what has been allowed to build up, and in light of the growing unreliability of company pension schemes it becomes incumbent on people to secure their own future.

It is reality that politicians, for all their sweet words – especially at election time – are going to supply little more than the absolute bare essentials for re-

In America the belief was held by many that the rise in the price of their houses was a factor that they could rely on to build a prosperous future.

The concept of one's home as an asset is not new and is not limited to America. Many people, in many countries, have held that view. No more so than in the UK where television programs frequently adopted the phase "getting on the property ladder".

Many American politicians, George Bush amongst them, extolled the virtues of property ownership. In the late 1960s, I remember attending a seminar in Scotland hosted by the Australian Department of Immigration.

The Australians were quick to point out that home ownership in Scotland at that stage was a mere 29% compared to over 60% in Australia.

Having been involved in personal financial planning for over a quarter of a century, I am very aware of the importance of home ownership as a cornerstone of a good financial plan.

The former chairman of America's central bank, Alan Greenspan, has frequently been criticized recently for allowing US interest rates to stay too low, too long, which caused, or at least contributed to the current US housing dilemma.

Sadly, it is true that the US housing issue is at the core of the current global crisis, but to finger Mr Greenspan as the cause of the problem is grossly unfair and is to totally distort the facts.

Alan Greenspan found that in the wake of the bursting of the internet bubble, the US economy was in a difficult situation.

Trillions of dollars had been taken from the savings of trusting Americans virtually overnight.

I still remember the earnest and enthusiastic young faces being interviewed on American television business channels in the late 1990s telling us that with the introduction of the internet and related technology, the business cycle as we had always known it had come to an end. No more summer and winter seasons in the economic cycle, but a continuous economic summer. Many honest people, who were maybe just a little bit greedy and a bit gullible, fell for this line and invested their savings in dot-com companies. They thought this was the route to securing their financial future.

After the dot-com bubble burst, many people viewed the stock market as little more than a casino.

Real estate, that was the answer. "Good old bricks and mortar, that's where value really lives!"

The demand for real estate rose. The more adventurous bought multiple dwellings, letting tenants pay off the mortgages which, in retirement, would be a solid source of income.

Unfortunately, real estate proved to be no more reliable than the stock market.

Both asset classes are, in reality, tied to the economic cycle.

The real estate sector was spared in the 2000 - 2003 downturn for two reasons. Firstly, on average, during the previous boom it had not risen as much as the stock market, and, secondly, it became the beneficiary of "good old bricks and mortar" thinking.

Now the property bubble has popped, the disadvantages of property compared to the stock market are evident.

Property is a difficult asset to sell in a buyers market; it is illiquid. Rents on secondary properties, even in global hot spots, have virtually collapsed along with their prices.

The banks, so keen to finance those deals, seem to regard property and borrowers as having some sort of communicable anti-social disease.

That is why once President-elect Barack Obama and his fellow world leaders have worked out how to rescue their various economies, they are going to be left with an embarrassing mou-ntain of debt – the financial equ-ivalent of giant heaps of toxic waste. In such a situation, politicians are at risk of facing the public's wrath - and being voted out.

A little bit of inflation, if they

can convince their local central bank, helps make these mountains more acceptable.

Inflation makes debt look smaller and incomes higher, but it does take the willing connivance of the local central bank to ensure that the chickens do not come home to roost.

What really scares both politicians and central banks is that other really nasty creature: deflation or disinflation – just ask any Japanese person.

April 2009


The script for the latest secret agent movie is stolen and many multinational corporations rush to deny that they are the basis for the shadowy group that the dashing English undercover agent must foil.

Hell on three wheels

It's time for the local authorities to consider enforcing existing laws that prohibit people from operating illegally modified vehicles, especially the island's ubiquitous saleng – motorcycles with sidecars.

While charming for tourists and cheap to operate for hawking noodles, collecting scrap and taking pigs to market, these vehicles pose a far greater threat to public safety than they are worth.

Hardly a day passes when a saleng is not involved in a road accident; and more often than not they are the cause. Just two months ago, a saleng driven on the wrong side of Thepkrasattri Rd caused a bus crash that left two dead and thirty others injured.

More frequently, however, the victims are the drivers themselves or their passengers – often family members including babies and young children.

Seldom equipped with proper lighting, saleng are particularly hazardous at night, when other drivers and pedestrians mistake them for normal motorcycles – often with fatal results.

While the use of saleng may be practical in many parts of rural Thailand, the Phuket "roadscape" now resembles something closer to that of the capital, perhaps the only place in Thailand where laws forbidding such vehicles are sometimes enforced.

Although there is nothing inherently hazardous about attaching a sidecar to a motorcycle, the failure of the police to enforce existing laws only encourages people to disregard safety by turning them into any kind of contraption they might fancy, including mobile butcher shops and fast food vending operations - complete with gas cylinders, vats of boiling water, and burning charcoal

It seems that knowing they can drive a completely illegal vehicle straight though a police checkpoint with impunity, simply encourages saleng operators to flout other traffic laws as well, driving on the wrong side of the road being routine among them.

Unfortunately, it seems unlikely that police and local leaders will take steps to address this hazard, and its horrific consequences, any time soon. After all, it wasn't too many years ago that a scandal resulted when the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) was giving away sidecars to the public, much to the shock of the Land Transport Office whose chief was asked to attend the handover ceremony.

More recently, politicians have used fleets of saleng (and illegal sound trucks) to appeal to "grassroots" supporters in their attempts to win elections.

Despite this, and given the clear record of carnage, it is nevertheless time to either announce the island as a "no-saleng zone" or, perhaps more practically, take steps to require that these vehicles at least be roadworthy; be driven on the correct side of the road; and be properly lit at night.

When the beauty of democracy is not so beautiful

he overthrow of the PPP government was justified on grounds that its electoral success was based on vote-buying and hence illegitimate.

Now the Democrats have been wafted into power by the divine intervention of Mr Newin Chidchob.

Should we laugh or cry? Mr Newin is allegedly Thailand's most famous vote-buyer.

In 1995, police raided a Buri Ram shophouse and found 11.3 million baht in small denomination notes, some stapled to a campaign flyer for Mr. Newin. These facts are not in doubt, nor (for most people) is the interpretation.

But the election law is rather like the prostitution law. Police have to catch the client both engaged in the act and paying the money at the same time, which is technically a bit difficult.

Judges convicted the shophouse owner, thus confirming that vote-buying had taken place on behalf of Mr. Newin. But they excused the man who had benefited – on the grounds that there was no direct evidence of his involvement.

In a tape transcript allegedly recorded in Songkhla in January 2005, someone addressed as "minister" proposes "we will buy everything everywhere" to overtake poll rivals.

"I'd like to challenge all of you from these 25 tambons in this way. If Thai Rak Thai wins, I'll give each tambon 100,000 baht.

Will you be able to take my

I'll leave the money with the governors.

On the morning of February 7, come and take it if we win. Take the money first, and we'll take care of the yellow and red cards later.

Get the winning votes, then come to collect the money from the governors, and go celebrate."

The press identified the voice as that of Mr. Newin. He was also the only minister in Songkhla at the time.

This attempt at wholesale vote-buying failed, but Mr Newin had escaped again.

The Election Commission, at the time firmly under Thaksinite influence, ruled that the tape-recording was "indecipherable" even though various Thai newspapers managed to transcribe it word for word.

Politics has no use for irony. But the role of Mr Newin has big implications for the incoming government because Mr Newin's nominees hold the balance of power in Parliament.

Mr Newin has been a prominent figure in Thai politics for over a decade.

He has been a minister for much of that time, though sometimes through a nominee.

It is hard to think of an achievement of national benefit from that time in office.

It is even harder to think of any speech or statement by Mr Newin about his political vision.

Perhaps his best-remembered quote came after another court case, when he narrowly escaped being banned from Parliament

He praised the judges' narrow 7-6 split-decision as "the beauty of democracy".

He was Agriculture Minister through the Thaksin era and the resulting scandals are just now reaching the courts.

Earlier this year, Mingkwan Saengsuwan secured a huge budget for rice price support and then woke up next morning to find the

CHANG

project had been ripped from his hands by Mr Newin.

The price of his support for the current government has been very high.

The Communications Ministry has the largest and chunkiest capital budget of them all.

The Interior Ministry is the single most powerful ministry, and many of those powers are marketable.

This truly is the beauty of democracy.

What does this portend for the Democrat-led coalition?

The installation of the new Abhisit government has been an action replay of Chuan II in 1997.

With an economic crisis looming, pressure from the army and business caused parties in the the ruling coalition to fracture, allowing the Democrats to stitch together a government, rewarding the splitters with plum ministries

A key figure in that split was Vatana Asavahem, now a fugitive from justice after conviction for massive corruption. After two in a row, this is confirmed as the Democrat Party route to power.

But as a guide to the prospects for the Abhisit government, Chuan I looks better than Chuan

In 1992, the Democrats headed a coalition formed in the aftermath of the May 1992 political crisis.

The crisis had stirred up hopes for reform and progress in many forms, and these hopes were riding on the Chuan government. Similar hopes are now riding on bhisit.

The Chuan I government did a relatively good job with the economy.

It reformed taxation, brought down tariffs, pushed for the Asean Free Trade Area, and completed reforms of the financial sector begun under its predecessor.

The economic impact of the 1992 political crisis was minimized because Mr Chuan's economic team was credible, foreign confidence was restored, and domestic business cooperated with government plans.

Growth revived after only a small dip. But other hopes for reform in the constitution, local government, judiciary, media, social policy, and the bureaucracy were sadly disappointed.

In almost every case, the pattern was the same. Conservative forces were able to manipulate the minor parties in the coalition to undermine proposals for reform.

Because the Democrats depended on these minor parties

for its majority, it was repeatedly vulnerable to this political black-

Management of the fractious coalition sapped the government's energy and ultimately brought the Chuan I government crashing down in a slew of corruption scandals.

The finale was the Phuket-based SorPorKor-401k land scandal, which involved several Democrat Party members, but there were many others involving the coalition partners.

One coalition MP was indicted in the US for smuggling massive quantities of marijuana into that country from Isarn.

Two others were denied US visas for suspected drug involvement

Another was embarrassed by the discovery of an illegal casino in his house.

One minister was suspected of masterminding a boom in oil smuggling.

Several government-related figures were involved in land scandals.


The way these scandals were exposed may also be a guide to this government's fate.

It was not the NGOs, academics, and other whistle-blowers that delivered the killer blow, but a group of young politicians.

Judging by their involvement in scandals under the following Banharn and Chavalit governments, they were not interested in cleaning up corruption, but taking it over.

Mr Newin was one of this group.

But then that is the beauty of democracy.

Chery QQ3 to offer a cheap ride in Thailand



hinese manufacturer Chery has entered the Thai market with two models, the diminutive QQ3 and the Tiggo SUV. The company expects to deliver around 5,000 cars a year, although in the current economic climate, that may prove a little optimistic.

Thai Chery Yarnyon Co. Ltd., is a joint venture between Thai Chia Tai Group and Thai Yarnyon. The company will assemble Chery automobiles from semi-knocked down (SKD) parts supplied from Chery's manufacturing plant in Wuhu in mainland China.

Although owned by the local government of Wuhu, the larger SAIC outfit based in Shanghai is a major investor.

At the launch of the Thai Chery brand in Hefei, the provincial capital city of Anhui, chairman of Chery Yarnyon, Vithit Leenutaphong said, "We are not only the distributor of Chery in Thailand, we will also promote Chery's development in this market, making it a brand recognized, favored and pursued by the majority of customers. We will create a successful Thai Chery story to equal the Chinese Chery story."

In many markets, including parts of the Middle East, India and South Africa, the QQ3 is without doubt the cheapest auto available. However, no prices have yet been quoted for the Thai vehicles

In 2003, Chery founded a research and development organization, quickly designing its own 3- and 4-cylinder engines. Despite the progress, Chery was

sued by GM Daewoo for copying that company's Daewoo Matiz. Chery claims that they licensed the vehicle design prior to General Motors' purchase of Daewoo. During Daewoo's bankruptcy in 2001–2002, Chery was able to source a number of engineers from South Korea's Daewoo, and those engineers took with them a complete set of plans and went on to create Daewoo vehicles at Chery.

In July 2007 Chery signed a deal with Chrysler to produce cars in China for export to the US company's dealers in North and South America. Several delays occurred, mainly due to quality control and safety concerns, and in early December 2008, at a time when Chrysler was seeking a bail-out from the US government, the plans to produce jointly-branded cars was shelved.

The Chery QQ3 is termed a 'mini city car' but it is fully Euro III compliant thanks to the Chinese company's tie-up with Austrian engine development company AVL-List. The smallest motor is a three-cylinder 800 cc gasoline powerplant, while there is also a 1.1 liter, 16-valve version available. Power outputs are a modest 52 bhp (38 kW) and 67 bhp respectively. Drive is through either a five-speed manual gearbox, or in the case of the larger engine, a four-speed automatic can be specified as an option.

Despite the low price, the QQ3 is surprisingly well equipped. It has power windows, power steering, central locking and other features that you would generally find on higher-priced sedans. The interior, though, is – in a word – cheap. It comprises acres of plastic and little in the way of real creature comforts.

The upper model, however, comes with dual airbags, ABS, air conditioning, a reasonable audio system with MP3 capability and a manual sunroof. Both models feature folding rear seats in a 60/40 split for versatility.

The QQ3 is undoubtedly a small car, with little in the way of

comfort or add-ons, but as shortjourney transportation, it would be hard to beat in terms of value for money.

The Chery QQ3 has already been successfully launched in Malaysia and the Philippines. The cars are gradually becoming more visible on the roads, particularly in Manila, but given the current economic crisis, it remains to be seen whether Thai Chery can bring the brand to Thailand in the immediate future. If they do gain acceptance here, it will be at the expense of the more established Japanese sub-compacts, such as Honda's Jazz and the small Toyotas and Nissans.

FOOTBALL: Eight boys from the Youth Football Home in Phuket were honored by HRH Princess Siriwanwaree Nareeratana after winning an international football tournament in Sweden.

The boys were invited to the palace after winning the under-11s section of the Gothia Cup with Thomrong Thai FC.

Cameras from all the major television stations were present as the boys paraded the trophy they had won in Sweden to Her Royal Highness.

All seven boys who started the final for Thomrong Thai FC under-11s came from the Youth Football Home in Phuket, an orphanage for boys from impoverished circumstances who show a particular aptitude for football.

The Gothia Cup, which takes place annually in Gothenburg, is the biggest youth football tournament in the world. Thomrong Thai FC won the final 2-0 with Nonthawit Onting, from the Youth Football Home, scoring both goals.

Nonthawit, who also finished as the competition's top scorer, told the *Gazette*, "I was really pleased to score the win-

ning goals. The other team was from Switzerland and they were much bigger than us, so it was great when we beat them."

It was the first time any of the boys had left Thailand and despite the 51,000 crowd at the opening ceremony, the Youth Football Home footballers were not intimidated.

Nonthawit said, "Sweden was fun. I wasn't scared and it was good that so many people came to watch us play. One day I would like to play football in Europe, maybe for Liverpool!"

The Youth Football Home was built on eight rai of land near Wat Muang Komaraphat in Thalang and opened in May 2006. It consists of a dormitory home for 32 boys, a residential building for staff and a full size football field plus training areas.

At the moment there are 32 boys living and studying there as well as a full complement of qualified staff to look after the children.

Hannu Tuukkanen, a former professional footballer from Finland, is the sports manager at the Youth Football Home.

He said, "We give a home and an education to boys who don't have parents or whose parents can't afford to educate them.

he world has just witnessed one of the greatest reversals in its economic history. While the past has dealt us a global depression, two world wars and stock market crashes, to name but a few, none of these have affected

every country and every asset class in the way this most recent crisis has.

For its part, Thailand has experienced its own share of problems of late: a coup, an election, mob rule and airport closures, again to name but a few.

The immediate impact on the Phuket economy is proving severe, much like the impact of the

Asian crisis, the 2004 tsunami, and the 2006 coup. Throughout these periods, real estate managed to hold its value and after a brief hiatus, prices continued to move steadily upward. The underlying strength in the market has a lot to do with Phuket being essentially a cash market.

The recent global meltdown of financial markets has certainly affected a lot of people's investment strategies and impacted plans for retirement. We have seen some buyers withdrawing from purchases, leaving an opportunity for others to buy-in at lower price levels. Timing is now more crucial than ever and anyone buying off-plan will be in a good position with the current

Since the second quarter of 2008, currencies such as the Australian and New Zealand dollar, sterling and the euro have witnessed an extreme drop in value,

particularly against the US dollar. The US, birthplace of the financial crisis and world economic meltdown and the country with the largest deficit, is now printing new money as fast as it can. You may ask yourself: is this really happening?

> We may see the fallen currencies rise against the dollar, restoring some semblance of normality, or it may be a case of the US leading us into this mess, and the market leading us out. Recent chart analysis points to this only being a short-term

The world's wealth is currently migrating towards

China, India, Russia, and Asia – and these countries are likely to be the economies that recover most rapidly from the crisis.

Conventional wisdom would suggest that the recent political and economic environment would have triggered a depreciation in the baht, although recently it has continued to rise. Logic dictates that once the political situation improves in Thailand, so will the economy and the strength of the baht. While the stock market currently remains at a multi-year low, it will not stay around the same levels once the present political problems are resolved.

Anybody currently purchasing property in Thailand is in a good position. The underlying value and investment return remain strong as Phuket continues to move forward as Asia's premier holiday and retirement destination.

Phuket versus the world | Russian property buyers target Phuket

atrick O'Neill is the presi dent and chief executive officer of the O'Neill Group, a real-estate advisory firm based in the US and Hong Kong.

O'Neill was key speaker at the 2008 DOMEXPO International Real Estate Show, held in Moscow, where he talked about the impact of the Russian and East European visitor segment on the Phuket property market.

According to O'Neill, the property buyer profiles closely match the visitor arrival profiles for resort destinations like Phuket. Although no official government statistics are available, O'Neill stated that nearly 15% of the total sales in Phuket made by the Richmond Group were from Russian purchasers.

In 2007 the European tourist sector accounted for over 30% or 1.4 million of the estimated five million visitors to Phuket, with the Russian market accounting for fewer than 8% of European arrivals.

In 2008, the Russian visitor count is expected to increase by over 40%, placing it as the thirdfastest-growing visitor segment behind Eastern Europe and Fin-

Prior to the recent political and financial events, Phuket airport arrivals were projected to continue the increased arrival trend which began in 2005, with a 65% increase forecast from 2005 to 2008, according to O'Neill. Current year-to-date figures indicate that the total arrival count may retreat slightly from


Annual Phuket average hotel occupancy for 2007 was 65%, with projections of 70% in 2008 prior to the political turmoil, according to O'Neill.

Year-to-date occupancy figures now suggest annual occupancy may stabilize around 60%. Average hotel occupancy in Phuket for 2006 was 61%.

Despite the temporary leveling off in the numbers of visitor arrivals, the future of the Phuket property market remains very strong, according to O'Neill, partially because most developments and individual sales are completed without financing or leverage.

"The economic fundamentals remain very strong for the Phuket real-estate market, including the proximity to the capital cities of Asia and Europe, direct flights, affordability, medical tourism and the booming retirement segment," said O'Neill.

O'Neill predicted that the Russian impact on the real-estate market would continue to grow, and combined with the East European segment, could account for over 20% of the market in



s a boy growing up, I remember being driven though the suburbs of many American towns and cities, particularly the outskirts, down by the railroad tracks. I would occasionally spot a depression-era wooden house, its paint peeling, with barren patches of grass and a hypnotic neon sign with the words "Psychic Readings – Know Your Future" illuminating the starless night.

I never did make it into one of those shady establishments, right out of a scene from *The Last Picture Show*, but, perhaps,

if I had, I might have gleaned an inkling of what was to come in 'Black October' in the year 2008.

L o o k i n g back just 12 short months, oil was being touted to hit over US\$200 dollars a barrel, Hilary Clinton was pegged as the next US president and

Thai politics was in turmoil. Well, at least we can depend on one thing remaining a constant. Now, as I write, with the price of oil hovering around US\$37 a barrel, Barack Obama's arrival in the Oval Office anticipated with much the same fervor as the second coming, and the Thai democratic process continuing its roller coaster ride, it is clear there have been some dramatic changes in


Predicting the year ahead

the lay of the land over the past

As we head into the New Year, the obvious question remains – what happens next?

Sadly, I am no descendant of Nostradamus, and given my larger-than-average frame, I'd scarcely fit down Alice's rabbit hole. That notwithstanding, there are clear signs emerging of what will come to pass in the coming

12 months. We are, without doubt, heading into a time of turbulence and crisis, the like of which most of us will never have experienced. Its effect will be felt throughout the world, across region and right here, by you and me. It will get worse before it



Staring into my café latte, a sorry substitute, I admit, for a crystal ball, I do foresee some fundamental changes affecting the property market here in Phuket. First off, there is the issue of supply and demand. The segment incorporating upscale 4-

5 bedroom villas on the west and east coast - be they oceanfront or significant ocean view - will most likely continue to trade at a premium. Given the substantial entry barriers for developments and the limited inventory of new and re-sale units, the key offerings in the first half of 2009 are the Amalfi and the new Banyan Tree Grand Residences, which are now providing a non-rental pool option. The top end of the market looks set to retain its lustre. This, as you are about to see, however, is the exception to the

The middle and lower segments are experiencing a substantial oversupply of existing product. With re-sales gathering pace, new projects are starting to show signs of a serious slowdown. These segments are looking vulnerable to a price re-alignment, bridging the current gap between prices being offered by owners and developers and what prospective purchasers are willing to pay. The current lack of parity has led, in the past few months, to a number of existing projects with unsold inventory offering discounts in the region of 20-30%. The 'vulture' buyers have begun to circle, expecting large write-downs over the coming six months. It needs to be acknowledged, however, that these

buyers are speculators and are not indicative of the larger marketplace. What is expected is that retail pricing will hold, but substantial discounts will be absorbed by those wishing to transact in the current maelstrom.

While property values will not, as a whole, decline, the market will plateau for an extended period. Moving forward, we will see only limited sales volume, in keeping with current global trends. An absence of debt in the marketplace is both a blessing and a curse. With the unavailability of financing to foreigners, who dominate the market, there is little existing leveraging. In an extended crisis, bank foreclosures in markets with significant domestic content, such as Bangkok, will come into play and over the longer term, drive market values down.

Here in Phuket property remains basically a cash trade, so while there is no danger of large scale property devaluation, new foreign buyers coming into the market cannot mitigate risk and get financing for new sales, which, in turn, severely limits short- to medium-term growth potential. Many cash-rich regional and Asian investors are

now looking to markets such as North America, Australia/New Zealand and even Europe to capitalize using debt leveraging.

As we look further into the future, an extended downturn will correct any supply-and-demand inequities and new launches will be limited until the existing supply can be absorbed into the market. This will create a good platform for longer term upward momentum. Risk profiles have shifted, with existing product outtrading off-plan in order to limit perceived development risk. For 2009, the general consensus is that it is going to be a challenging marketplace for property, so it's best to buckle up and hopefully steer clear of those potholes on our journey into the future.
