Tourist miraculously survives fall

PATONG: A young Norwegian tourist fell from his eighth-story hotel room on Tuesday January 20, miraculously surviving with only minor injuries.

At about 8 am, Kathu Police were informed that a foreign tourist had fallen from his room on the eighth floor of the Phuket Palace Hotel, at the south end of Patong on the road to Karon.

Fearing the worst, Kathu Police Duty Officer Nitikorn Rawang and rescue workers from the Kusoldharm Foundation rushed to the scene.

There they found 26-yearold Norwegian tourist Hans Christian Dalen lying on the ground. He was barely conscious but remarkably still very much alive.

In fact, the young Norwegian might well have passed out hours earlier from simple intoxication, as he had been up all night drinking with some new friends he met while out on the town in Patong, the center of Phuket's vibrant nightlife scene.

Mr Dalen told the Gazette from his bed at Phuket International Hospital that he and a friend, also Norwegian, had that night befriended three Thai women – two of them ladyboys - and invited them back to his room for a nightcap.

Dalen and his friend asked the three Thais to leave.

When they refused, a fight broke out and one of the ladyboys hit Mr Dalen in the face before running away, he said.

Undeterred, the two Scandinavians continued their drinking session right through dawn. Standing out in the morning light, Mr Dalen suddenly lost his footing and fell off the room's small balcony.

By sheer luck or divine After a few hours, Mr providence, the area right below

his window was – like much of Phuket these days – occupied by a ramshackle workers camp.

Mr Dalen landed with a crash onto its corrugated zinc roof, then fell to the ground.

Remarkably, the zinc roofing sufficiently broke his fall and he did not break his back or go into a coma – as incorrectly reported in one lurid and highly inaccurate account of the accident in the Thai-language media.

Mr Dalen was rushed to

Phuket International Hospital, where he is now being treated for some serious bruises and a lacerated left hand that required stitches.

"I fell because I was drunk. I'm very lucky not only to be alive but to have escaped with only minor injuries," he said.

"The doctor told me I could leave on Wednesday (Jan 21). I'll return to the same hotel, Phuket Palace, until I go back to my country on January 25," he told the Gazette. -Atchaa Khamlo

Owner of Farang Restaurant chain slain by bike assassin

PHUKET CITY: The owner of tional, known to his friends as rant chain, Chit Raknanga, was shot dead as he dined at one of his own restaurants with friends on January 16.

Police say it will probably take a few weeks of investigation before they know if they will be able to identify and arrest the gunman responsible for the murder.

The 36 year-old victim, a successful and popular Thai na-

the Phuket-based Farang Restau- "Tik", was shot at close range by a man who had arrived at the restaurant on the back of a motorcycle.

> According to an eyewitness who spoke to the Gazette, the killer walked into the restaurant at about 9:30 pm and shot the victim three times: once in the head and twice in the body. He then fled on the motorcycle, driven by an accomplice.

Tik was killed instantly,

while his friend, 37-year-old engineer Supaht Chaiyodong, suffered gunshot wounds and was rushed to hospital.

Less than 10 people were reported to have been dining in

the restaurant at the time of the murder. Phuket City Police arrived at the scene approximately 20 minutes later, according to the

The victim was sitting at a table with two friends when the murder occurred, police said.

The victim's brother Chart, also in the restaurant at the time of the shooting, told the *Gazette* that Tik's body, accompanied by his wife Tien, has now been flown to his home in Ubon Ratchathani for cremation. Arrangements would also be made for meritmaking ceremonies here in Phuket, he said.

A high-level source in the Phuket Provincial Police told the *Gazette* that investigators were not yet sure of the motive for the killing and were following several lines of inquiry, including the possibility of personal and business-related conflicts. Given the *modus operandi* of the shooting, the killer is presumed to have been a hired assassin.

Police say physical evidence, including a .38 caliber bullet slug recovered at the scene, should aid the investigation.

One local Thai-language newspaper reported that Phuket City Police Inspector for Investigations Wichak "The Magnet" Tarom had been assigned to the case and had gone to Phang Nga to follow up on a number of leads.

However, on January 20 Phuket City Police Deputy Superintendent Chaiwat Ooykham admitted that there had not been much progress in the investigation and that it will probably take a few weeks before police know if they stand a chance of catching the gunman or the party who contracted him.

The partially open-air Farang Restaurant serving Italian, European and Thai food on the bypass road opposite Index is one of two Farang Restaurant branches in Phuket, the other being in Cherng Talay. A third branch was recently opened in Bangkok.

According to a *Gazette* shareholder who was close to the victim, preparations were already underway to move the restaurant's current location on the bypass road to The Point, a new apartment complex opposite Big C.

Navy defends action against refugees

PHANG NGA / PHUKET: In response to allegations regarding the mistreatment of illegal foreign nationals trying to gain entry into Thailand, officials from the Third Area Naval Command Supreme Headquarters in Phang Nga defended the actions of the Thai Navy on Sunday January 11.

Songkitti Jakabat, Chief of Staff at the Phang Nga headquarters, told the *Gazette* that those attempting to gain unlawful entry are naturally prohibited from doing so and are then the responsibility of border officials.

"Once the refugees are in Thailand, it is our duty to detain them in order to question them before they are sent back to their country," he said.

"It's difficult to prevent them from coming across as there are a number of back door entries into the country. Normally we get information from the media about people trying to enter the country. It's very helpful if and when we receive advance warning," he added.

While inquiries continue into claims that Rohingya refugees were pushed out to sea or mistreated by Thai authorities, Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva said yesterday that the Thai Navy did not undertake any action that abused the boat people's rights.

"The military, as far as I have checked, handled them in line with the Internal Security Operation Command, and we don't have a policy to violate human rights," Abhisit told reporters.

"If any officials committed such inhumane acts against them, they would be punished."

The Navy has been accused of towing nearly 1,000 Burmese Rohingya and Bangladeshis out to sea in December. More than 500 of them went missing and may have died.

The United Nation's refugee body in Geneva called yesterday for its officials to be given access to two groups of Rohingya boat people in custody in the South.

"We have today asked the Thai government for access to two groups totaling 126 Rohingya boat people who are in custody in southern Thailand in order to assess their situation and determine whether any of them are in need of international protection," UNHCR spokesman Ron Redmond said.

"This follows our expression of strong concern to the government last week over allegations that large groups of Rohingya boat people from Myanmar [Burma] were intercepted in Thai waters, towed out to sea and left to die.

"According to information from our sources, a group of 80 Rohingya boat people are being held on Koh Sai Daeng off the Thai coast in the Andaman Sea.

A further 46 Rohingya who were intercepted on a boat last Friday were reportedly handed over to Thai military authorities, and we are trying to determine where they are now.

"Given the new Thai government's commitment to human rights, we are eager to discuss with Foreign Minister Kasit Piromya ways that this crisis can be defused quickly in line with international humanitarian standards.

We have stressed that the Thai government should take all measures to make sure the lives of the Rohingya boat people are not put at risk."

News about the boat people was broken last week by a group dedicated to the Rohingyas and widely reported overseas.

Some survivors told Indian Coast Guards and international media their boat was towed out to sea by the Thai Navy and given two sacks of boiled rice and two gallons of water before being abandoned in the middle of the sea.

Asked if this story was made up to discredit the government, Abhisit said there was not a big movement to do so but a few people might be interested in exaggerating the information.

"Some reports suggested the boat people arrived in a boat with no engine and tried to sink the boat to get on our shore," Abhisit said.

But the government would not allow illegal migrants into Thailand or to harm national security, he said. However, he said the authorities must handle boat people in accordance with human rights principles.

Foreign Ministry spokesman Tharit Charungvat said the ministry was looking into the affair with Defence officials.

The government would invite ambassadors from concerned states to discuss the matter if it could obtain more details from the investigation, he said.

The illegal entry of migrants, notably facilitated by human traffickers, would affect national security, he said.

Spokesman Ron Redmond said the UNHCR welcomed Deputy Prime Minister Suthep Thaugsuban's announcement that he had ordered the defense minister to investigate claims of maltreatment.

"The Rohingya are stateless Muslims from northern Rakhine state in Myanmar [Burma]. There are 28,000 Rohingya recognized refugees in two UNHCR camps in Bangladesh and some 200,000 unregistered Rohingya living outside the camps there.

For several years now, in this season, many of them have been desperate enough to risk their lives at sea in small boats sailing from Bangladesh or Myanmar, often turning up in Thailand, Malaysia or as far away as Indonesia.

"Because the plight of the Rohingya is a regional problem, UNHCR is urgently seeking to discuss with the Thai government ways that all concerned countries can address the root causes that impel the Rohingya to put their lives at risk on such perilous journeys.

"We look forward to discussing with Foreign Minister Kasit ways that the new Thai government, given both its key role in the region and its current chairmanship of ASEAN, can play a vital role in addressing this alarming regional issue."

Phuket receives limited support for tourism initiatives

PHUKET: The Cabinet meeting on January 20 approved just four measures from a total of 13 proposed to revive tourism in the near future. It was decided that fees for certain visas will be waived for three months for visitors of all nationalities, although this move is widely seen as being targeted predominantly at China, one of Thailand's biggest and strategically important markets.

Phuket Immigration Superintendent Chanatpol Yongbunjerd told the *Gazette* that the waiver of visa fees would only apply to 30-day and 60-day tourist visas. He could not say exactly when the three-month period of free tourist visas would begin as the start date had not yet been set.

Additionally, entrance fees at all national parks will be cut, in an effort to boost domestic tourism. However, managment at Sirinat National Park in Nai Yang could not say how much park fees would be reduced by and when any reduction of fees would come into effect. Foreign visitors to the park are currently charged 200 baht each, while locals are charged 20 baht.

Lastly, aircraft landing and parking fees will be discounted at major airports around the country. However, when the *Gazette* spoke to Phuket International Airport Director Wicha Nernlop, he said that although charter flights would receive reductions in landing fees at Chaing Mai, Chaing Rai, Haad Yai and Don Muang airports, flights arriving at Phuket International Airport would not receive such a reduction.

"Phuket Airport is excluded from this incentive because parking space for aircraft is already limited; we do not want to promote the airport any further," he

Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva said the tourism industry needed to be revived with the help of such initiatives. He earlier claimed that tourist arrivals were returning close to levels seen before the political crisis in Bangkok that resulted in the eight-day closure of the capital's two large commercial airports.

The proposals that failed to win approval include the cutting of hotel room rates and air fares on Thai Airways International, reducing the VAT on hotel rooms for one year, waiving the annual fee of 80 baht per room and an urgent plan to more actively promote Phuket, Krabi and Phang Nga as domestic tourist destinations.

PM Abhisit made no mention of likely job losses in the tourism industry or of the extra budget of 15 billion baht requested by the Tourism Ministry to help smaller operators affected by the recent crisis.

However, the Cabinet did sanction one billion baht to help tourism and related businesses. Industry representatives insist, however, that more funding will be needed to support the recovery effort. Prakit Chinamourphong, president of the Thai Hotels Association, said three- and four-star hotels planned to discount room rates by 50% for people visiting the country during February and March.

The markets targeted by the new proposals include China, India, the Middle East, Singapore, Hong Kong, South Korea and Japan, he said.

Most hotels in Bangkok and other major tourist cities are running at lower-than-usual occupancy rates, in the wake of the recent airport closures.

Phuket Tourist Association Vice President Bhuritt Maswongsa told the *Gazette* that hotel occupancy on the island was currently about 50% at a time when they were expected to be near or at 100%.

While the situation appears to be gradually approving, he said the low season could kick in as early as February and will likely continue through until October

Mr Bhuritt welcomed the four measures, but said the government needs to take a closer look at the two main factors causing what he described as Thailand's "tourism recession": the global economic crisis and a lack of confidence among foreign tourists following the closure of the Bangkok airports.

Global economic factors were largely beyond the government's control, so offering economic incentives such as the waiver of visa fees might not help much if people don't have enough money to travel, he said.

However, he said he had already received a number of calls from curious tour operators in mainland China about the decision to waive visa fees, which Thai consulates have not yet been informed about. However, a PR campaign to restore the image of Thailand as a tourist destination could help and he had urged new Tourism and Sports Minister Chumpol Silapa-archa to pursue this during a recent visit to Phuket.



After a losing a valuable necklace he had received from his family, relief for Saul Salfati came in the form of the Tourist Police volunteers. Campaign warns of dangers of fake goods

BANGKOK: European tourists landing home after holidays in Thailand had better check their luggage carefully from now on: they could be greeted with fines and even jail terms if customs officials find counterfeit items.

This is the message of the Intellectual Property Department, which last week launched a campaign with Airports of Thailand (AOT) to raise awareness of the dangers of taking pirated products sourced in Thailand to Europe. Thai shoppers were also warned about buying counterfeit items abroad.

Deputy Commerce Minister Alongkorn Ponlaboot said his ministry would work to encourage people to use only copyrighted products so as to boost Thailand's image in the international community.

Counterfeit goods are not only destroying the Kingdom's image and damaging business, but also harming producers and importers. With new laws recently implemented by many countries, consumers are now being punished too, Mr Alongkorn said.

As a measure to dissuade both foreign and local shoppers from buying illicit goods and taking them overseas, the department has put up billboards at Suvarnabhumi Airport, alerting them to the stiff penalties awaiting them under each country's laws.

For instance, if travelers carry fakes to France, they could be imprisoned and fined up to the equivalent 13.7 million baht.

European nations since the beginning of 2006 have stepped up efforts to crack down on coun-

terfeit products that have undermined the luxury goods industry.


Checks in France, the homeland of designer brands like Chanel and Louis Vuitton, are said to be the strictest, followed by Italy and Germany.

Counterfeit products that Thai and foreign shoppers must be cautious about are brandname bags and wallets, sunglasses, perfumes, cosmetics, clothes, watches, CD/VCD/DVDs and replica football shirts.

Phuket Airport Director Wicha Nernlop told the *Gazette* on January 20 that no such signs had yet been installed at Phuket International Airport.

He said it was the first he had heard of the issue and that he intended to call AOT to learn more about the campaign. Source: *Daily Xpress*





Phuket Fishing Port expansion nears completion

KOH SIREH, PHUKET: The 300-million-baht expansion of Phuket Fishing Port pier that began in 2006 is due for completion by the end of this month.

The twin goals of the project were to improve the hygiene standards of the 860m-long pier and to develop the facility into a tuna transit center for the southern region of Thailand.

The pier now features a clean water supply, a waste-water treatment system and facilities such as freezer rooms and ice plants.

The project has involved the construction of four docks. Three of them are now complete and already operational, with work on the fourth dock underway and expected to be finished by the end of the month.

Pramual Rakjai, chief of Phuket Fishing Port office explained that the facilities Phuket has to offer, such as the pier and the international airport, make it an attractive choice as a transit center for ships engaged in tuna fishing. Phuket is used to send tuna directly abroad to countries such as Japan.

He told the *Gazette*, "The pier is only five days away from one of the biggest tuna fishing

grounds in the world, the Indian Ocean, making it highly convenient for ships looking to transport their tuna catch to other parts of the world. Moreover, the pier now houses a freezing room with the capacity to store 600 tons of tuna."

Mr Pramual explained that Phuket's success as a tuna transit center brings great economic benefits to the island, estimating that fishermen spending money on necessities such as food and clothing during their stay at the pier were bringing in around 100,000 baht a day to the province's economy.

He added that the pier would become an increasingly important provider of employment as the center's success grew.

The tuna fishing season lasts six months, from November until April. Currently, most fishing ships using the tuna center are from Taiwan and China, with a number from Indonesia.

No Thai ships presently use the facility, although the authorities plan to increase Thai involvement. This may involve transforming Thai trawlers into tuna fishing boats by modifying their equipment, for example by equipping them with hooks rather than trawling nets.


Normally, around two to five ships dock at the pier carrying tuna every day, with around 11 more using the facility for other reasons. At one stage, the tuna center processed 4,000 tons of tuna a year, but last year processed only half as much due to the high price of gasoline.

With the current lower price of fuel the fishery pier is expecting to process around 3,000 tons this year.

There are already a number of companies processing the tuna brought to the center, such as Sri Fong, Fu Thai, Hai Fong and Chee Fong. Mr Parmual expects there to be many more in the future.

Two types of tuna are brought back to the center: big eye tuna and yellow fin tuna, caught to eat fresh or for eating raw in sushi. These types of tuna are distinct from skipjack tuna, which large Japanese ships transport to the Deep Sea Port and which is used to make canned tuna





Growth of CCTV surveillance by Phuket police

PHUKET CITY: Phuket is an island under surveillance, with 16 police closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras in each of the three locales of Patong, Kata-Karon and Phuket City, not to mention the scores of cameras operated by goldshops, hotels, restaurants, shopping malls and other private operators.

Now seeking to expand its CCTV surveillance into Kamala, Cherng Talay, Tung Tong, Tah Chatchai and other parts of Thalang, Phuket Provincial Police have asked Phuket Governor Preecha Ruangjan to approve a budget for more than 80 additional cameras to be installed in 2010.

There have been a number of pledges by police departments in Phuket to roll out additional CCTV cameras since the original 48 cameras were installed.

Kathu Police Superintendent Col Grissak Songmoonnak announced in March 2008 that he wanted to install around 10 more cameras in Patong, though these have not yet materialized.

In October last year he said that the installation of 16 additional cameras would be provided by the Savoey Seafood restaurant to provide better security for tourists on Soi Bangla.

In August 2008, Rawai Mayor Aroon Solos announced that his municipality had been granted 20 million baht in central government funding for 32 CCTV cameras, with installation set to begin in early 2009.

The current network of 48 cameras is controlled from command centers in Kathu, Chalong and Phuket City Police Stations, which have jurisdiction for Patong, Kata-Karon and greater Phuket City, respectively.

The systems, which came on-line in February 2007, were provided under a 16-million-baht contract with telecommunications provider CAT Telecom.

The police claim that the CCTV cameras proved a success in 2008, helping to catch thieves and alert the police to traffic congestion, as well as providing evidence in criminal cases.

However, Phuket police have yet to introduce the kind of traffic monitoring system that allowed the Bangkok Metropolitan Police to fine over 36,000 motorists caught running red lights in the capital over an initial 10-day period.

The Bangkok surveillance system, unveiled in late December, record images of sufficient resolution to allow police to read license plates – and then fine traffic law violators though the mail.

Cherngpipat Detch-krutthanon, who heads up a Phuket City Police crime suppression unit, told the *Gazette* that officers on the island are making do with what they have.

Most of their cameras, low-cost units that are fixed in place, produce low-quality images and have insufficient zoom capacity to allow identification of license plate numbers, he said.

Each of Phuket's three districts also has one dome camera, which produces high quality video images and can be rotated. These are three times as expensive as the fixed units, however.

In short, Phuket Provincial Police currently lack the budget to buy equipment needed to implement a system like the one in Bangkok.

Pol Sen Sgt Maj Cherngpipat explained that as well as aiding law enforcement and acting as a deterrent to would-be criminals, CCTV cameras are reassuring for foreign tourists who might be worried about their safety.

"CCTV cameras have been used for a long time in Western countries. Our system will bring Phuket up to the same standards. Tourists will trust our security system," he said.

It may take some time before Phuket's network reaches that point – and the current CCTV systems have not been without problems.

Many of the cameras need readjustment to optimize image quality, while reflections from car headlights at night also affect the officers' ability to monitor events, Sen Sgt Maj Cherngpipat said.

When the *Gazette* visited the CCTV command center in Phuket City, which displays images from all 48 cameras, a few units were out of order. It generally takes two or three days to order the parts needed to fix broken units, Sen Sgt Maj Cherngpipat explained.

There has also been some confusion about who is responsible for repairs and maintenance.

CAT Telecommunications had hired a company called Bosch to install and maintain the cameras, but when Phuket City Police called the company to fix broken units the company always came late, he claimed.

When asked about this, a representative of the Bosch company referred the *Gazette* to CAT.

A CAT representative told the *Gazette* that he always ordered repairs to be carried out by Bosch, who have the service contract for all three systems. However for contract and payment reasons the work needs be ordered though CAT, not directly by the police to Bosch.


Looking forward, Phuket City Police plan to hire CCTV experts to help with the operation of their network.


CCTV is new for police in Thailand and officers here in Phuket have so far had to make do without expert training and advice in its most effective use, Sen Sgt Maj Cherngpipat said.

Phuket Police also plan to display real-time CCTV images on-line, allowing members of the public to check for traffic congestion before traveling or report accidents, he said.

Medical units to be renovated for easier disabled access

BANGKOK: Disabled people will soon enjoy easier access to treatment because the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) plans to renovate 10,000 primary healthcare units across the country, a senior health officer said.

Dr Komart Jungsathiansab, director of the Ministry's Society and Health Institute, said buildings housing most primary healthcare units were not easy to access for the elderly and handicapped.

At present, most primary healthcare units are housed in twostorey buildings, with the second floor devoted to treatment rooms. The units have been set up in this manner for 25 years now to avoid flooding. Unfortunately, patients have climb up to the second floor to see the doctor.

Some are not able to manage the stairs, while some have to stop and take a rest midway, Dr Komart said.

About 11% of the population or seven million people in Thailand are elderly, with most suffering from chronic diseases or motor problems.

Since most of the elderly needed constant medical attention, about 80% of the units needed structural changes to allow easy access, he said.

The ministry is also asking the government to approve a budget of 1.3 billion baht for the reconstruction of 2,000 primary healthcare units nationwide.

The MoPH has teamed up with the Association of Siamese Architects under Royal Patronage to design new buildings and to renovate existing units.

Each unit has been granted a budget of 500,000 baht for renovation, while 2 million baht has been allocated for each new structure.

Hospital workers threaten strike

NAKHON RATCHASIMA: More than 90,000 contract employees of all government hospitals across the country have threatened to stage a nationwide strike if their demands for pay rises and welfare benefits are not met.

Speaking at Nakhon Ratchasima university on January 18, employee leaders said all workers at 875 government hospitals and public health stations would stop if their four demands were not met by next month.

Protest leader Kanokphorn Suksanit said the strike would not be carried out in a way that would affect treatment of patients or threaten their health.

One demand calls for immediate payment of monthly allowances for those working at hospitals in the three strife-torn southern provinces. Such payment was made until three years ago, but ceased due to a legal loophole in Public Health Ministry regulations. The employees also demanded their base monthly salary be raised from the current 6,800 baht and that an annual raise be granted each year to cope with inflation and high commodity prices.

Dr Suphan Srithamma, a senior ministry official, said a special monthly allowance could not be paid to the employees unless a Finance Ministry rule was amended. He said he believed no employees would stage a strike because their year-by-year contracts could be revoked for "misbehavior".

However, a number of allowances would be approved sometime this week, he added.



BANGKOK: Some Thai laborers might not be able to retire if the government does not implement measures to assist them, according to a recent study by Chulalongkorn University (CU).

At present some 12 million laborers in the retirement fund system stand to get a pension when they reached 55 or 60 years of age, said the study presented at a seminar by the National Economic and Social Advisory Council (NESAC) and CU Academic Service Center.

However some 22 million laborers, or 70% of the overall 35 million laborers aged between 16 to 60, have not joined retirement funds promoted by the state. About 16 million of these workers are farmers, while the rest are working at odd jobs with low incomes such as taxi drivers or construction workers.

If left to save money for their old age, these low-paid and less-educated laborers may have great difficulty in later life and could become a burden on the country.

As a result, NESAC asked the CU Academic Service Center to do the study and suggest how the government could help these people.

After conducting the study, the researchers urged the government to set up a savings fund for retirement for laborers whose low incomes, job natures and other social aspects limit their access to existing retirement funds.

The proposed fund would sell them "saving units" at 100 baht each. During the first five years the government would contribute an additional 30% to every saving units bought, with a limit of up to 12 saving units per month or 60 units per year. Thus government contribution could be up to 1,800 baht per head per year as an incentive to get them into saving money for retirement.

After the first five years and until the subscriber reaches 60 years old, the government would continue to contribute 10% to the newly bought units. This proposed fund would be managed by professionals to yield profits in the long term to support retirees' needs, the researchers said.

Japanese to fund road death research project

NONTHABURI: five-member research team from the Asian Institute of Technology in Nonthaburi has been granted 150,000 baht from Japan's Mitsui Sumitomo Insurance Welfare Foundation (MSIWF) to study why so many people die in road accidents in the Kingdom.

Policymakers and police haven't reflected on whether measures they have issued or implemented are appropriate, said team member Chanida Anurakamolkul.

Since police have reported that speeding was a main cause of road accidents her team had decided to focus its study on traffic signs for speed limits; engineering design, such as rumble strips; and traffic law enforcement, such as using cameras as evidence to fine speeding drivers.

The team will use a questionnaire to find out if drivers agree or disagree, obey or ignore the current speed management measures.

After completing this research, the team will present its findings to policymakers and police next year.

MSIWF has been supporting initiatives in the areas of automobile accident prevention since its inception in 1975. The AIT grant is the first of its kind in Thailand.

Prime Minister defends low income stimulus plan

BANGKOK: Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva said recently that he has studied situations in several countries and is confident that the handing out of free-gift money of 2,000 baht to low-income people would be the most effective way to stimulate the economy.

Other measures, especially tax-related measures, would be too slow to halt the economic slowdown.

"The fire is burning fiercely, so we cannot be too economical on the water for putting out the blaze," pm Abhisit said during his weekly TV program aired on the government-run NBT network.





Martial law under review

BANGKOK: Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva has announced a thorough review regarding the use of martial law in the Deep South and will decide on its extension within three months.

"I will ask the people involved to now run a systematic review of the various laws, so the next time they ask for an extension it will not be automatic," said Prime Minister Abhisit, addressing an audience at the Foreign Correspondents Club of Thailand on January 14.

Narathiwat, Pattani and Yala, as well as Chana and Thepha in Songkhla, have been under emergency decree since October of 2005, allowing authorities to seize suspected separatists and keep them detained without charges.

Security personnel engaged in such operations are granted immunity.

The decree has so far been extended 14 times, coming up for parliamentary approval every three months.

Over 3,200 killed, B109m spent fighting insurgency

The southern unrest has taken a huge human and fiscal toll over the past five years, with over 3,000 people killed and 109 billion baht of state budget used to try and stifle the violence.

Quelling just one violent incident last year cost taxpayers 88 million baht on average, according to the latest study conducted by Deep South Watch.

The results were revealed at a recent seminar organized by Deep South Watch and the Southern Thai Journalists Association.

The independent Deep South Watch network said on January 18, that Thailand might have to spend up to 300 billion baht annually over the next five to 10 years to deal with the insurgency in Yala, Narathiwat, Pattani and parts of Songkhla.

Based on records for 2004-2008, there has been an average of 1,956 violent incidents annually.

Overall, the conflict has already taken 3,287 lives and left 5,405 people wounded. Last year witnessed 718 incidents, down over 50% from the 1,861 recorded in 2007.

Last year, on average, there was a fraction under two attacks every day .

This was a great improvement over the previous four years, which averaged five incidents daily, however, the severity of attacks has intensified.

Vaipoj Srinuan, deputy permanent secretary for defence, said the statistics released by Deep South Watch should serve as useful information and data to plan for a more integrated strategy in ending the southern conflict.

It is crucial to think outside the box in order to tackle the southern unrest successfully as social and other dimensions, besides national security, are also very important for policy-making, he added.

Judging from the numbers and pattern of the conflict, the southern situation has reached a stalemate.

Prasit Methsuwan, adviser to the Federation of Teachers from the Southern Border, said that as the number of incidents had declined, the number of Thai Buddhists living in Yala, Pattani and Narathiwat has also dwindled.

At least 70,000 of an estimated population of 300,000 Thai Buddhists have already left the three provinces for other places.

In that sense, the insurgents have succeeded in embedding a climate of fear in those provinces, Prasit said.

The three provinces are home to about 1.8 million people.

Other participants and commentators were hopeful that the Abhisit government would be more receptive to views expressed by local communities and use them as inputs in the formulation of a future strategy.

They urged the new government to use political means to end the current conflict rather than focus exclusively on military force, like the previous governments, which had led to more violations of human rights.

Looking ahead, seminar participants called on the government to restore law and order and bring to justice those committing crimes against the people living in southern Thailand.

Six Krabi rubber robbers caught

SURAT THANI: Region 8 Police have arrested six men for an alleged series of armed robberies on rubber plantations in Krabi and Nakhon Sri Thammarat provinces.

The arrests came after the group lost control of their pickup truck during a shoot-out with police as they were trying to make their escape, following a robbery in Krabi's Khao Phanom District.

The arrests were announced on January 14 by Region 8 Commissioner Santhan Chaiyanon at Police Region 8 Headquarters in Surat Thani.

Two of the suspects, 44-year-old Somchai Bangkaow and his 17-year-old relative, who cannot be named for legal reasons, were arrested near the scene of the robbery. Four more suspects were arrested following subsequent investigation, he said.

Lt Gen Santhan identified two of the remaining suspects as Amnat Krainara, 42, and Somneuk Kaensang, 45. The two other suspects were minors, both 17-yearolds.

The suspects all confessed that they had committed five or six robberies in the area since August of last year. Police seized a metallic silver Mazda pickup truck and 455 sheets of rubber as evidence, Lt Gen Santhan added.

The arrests followed the January 9 robbery of a rubber

plantation belonging to 58-year-old Chalermphol Khreuachan in tambon Khok Han, Khao Phanom district, Krabi.

Police arrived at the scene as the robbers were driving away. The robbers opened fire and a shoot-out ensued. Police pursued the suspects into neighboring Nakhon Sri Thammrat province until the driver of the suspects' pickup truck lost control, crashing the vehicle by the side of the road in Tambon Ku Rae, Thung Yai District.


The suspects made their escape on foot, but in the early hours of January 10, police arrested one of the 17-year-olds about 300 meters from the site of the crash, where he was lay-

ing injured. Police also arrested Mr Somchai after he checked into Thung Song Hospital to get treatment for injuries sustained in the crash.

From interrogating the two suspects, police were able to get the names of the rest of the gang and had arrest warrants issued by Krabi Provincial Court. The two 17-year-old suspects were arrested on a train in Chumphon's Lang Suan District as they were on their way to hide out in Bangkok.

The robberies were a family affair with the suspects, originally from Phatthalung province, all related to one and other. They have been charged with armed robbery, attempted murder and firearms offences, Lt Gen Santhan said.

Deer numbers declining, extinction feared

KOH PHANGAN: Fears are dragging it to the shore but were growing for the future of the Sambar deer after another was found dead in the sea near Thong Sala, Koh Phangan this month.

Park officials from the island said that villagers reported its discovery after a fisherman spotted the dead creature. He claimed to have heard several dogs barking and later saw the body of the lifeless animal floating in the water. Villagers attempted to save the deer by too late.

When rangers arrived at the scene they identified the animal as being about five years of age, weighing about 250 kilograms. It appeared to have died from drowning but also had wounds, possibly inflicted by dogs.

The Sambar deer is endangered and despite efforts to repopulate the island with a pair of breeding deer in 1989, the numbers are thought to have declined to fewer than 100.

Chaichana Vichaidit, chief of park services, said that the deer once numbered in excess of

Nearly 50 animals are being lost each year, with most of the recorded deaths the result of hunting or drowning. The commercial development of the island has also forced the creatures into unfamiliar territory, increasingly leaving them at the mercy of dogs or hunters.

Oil tanker sinks near Koh Samui, two feared dead

KOH SAMUI: An oil tanker sank in the waters between Koh Samui and Khanom district during a period of bad weather.

The tanker, heading to Koh Samui, was believed to be laden with 1,000 liters of oil when it was battered by high seas, causing it to founder.

A passing ship came to the rescue of the tanker and was said to have retrieved four out of the six crew members from the water near the vessel.

The remaining two crewmen could not be located and are presumed to have drowned in

the rough waters.

The surviving crew members were named as Sawen Thongwan, Sornphet Ompraser, Nipan Sueleung and the captain of the vessel Nathee Kwinthaweekul. Marine police are now questioning them in the search for clues as to why the accident oc-

Officials are still looking into the environmental damage that may have been caused when the ship went down but have commented that the strong currents would have helped to disperse the spill.

Scorpion queen does it again

KOH SAMUI: One of Koh Samui's best known tourist attractions can now proudly boast a world record holder as part of

Kanjana Kaetkaew, 39, a native of Samui, has recently set a Guinness World Record for holding a deadly scorpion in her mouth for over two minutes.

Kanjana, known around the country as "the Scorpion Queen", surpassed her own record, which she set last year when she held one of the creatures in her mouth for over a minute at the island's Snake Farm, a popular tourist

She is currently attempting to break another record by remain-

ing in a room containing 5,000 scorpions for 33 days and nights at the Royal Garden Mall in Pattaya. This would break her previous best of staying with 3,400 scorpions for 32 days back in 2002.

Giant chilli heats up Local Food Festival



DJ Krafty Kuts and Dynamite MC

artin Reeves, aka DJ Krafty Kuts, is one of the biggest names in dance music, known for playing a style of bassline-heavy breakbeat strongly influenced by funk and hip hop. According to legend, Krafty Kuts was born when Reeves entered a DJ competition aged 17 without ever having touched a pair of decks before – and made it to the finals.

Dominic Smith, aka Dynamite MC, made his name in the drum'n'bass scene as MC for Bristol's Roni Size and Reprazent, whose debut album, New Forms, won the prestigious Mercury Music Prize in the UK in 1997, bringing drum'n'bass to the attention of a mainstream audience. His voice is one of the most recognizable in UK dance music.

All credit to Club Lime, then, for playing host to both of them on Saturday January 2, bringing a different kind of party to Patong Beach. The *Gazette* caught up with both of them before the gig...

Gazette: What do you make of Thailand?

Dynamite: Very, very cool place. Obviously I've only been in Phuket a few hours, so I'm not sure yet. But Bangkok; a lot of people I spoke to said it's dirty, it's filthy, it's dodgy, but I got there and it's such a cool city. It's got a South American feel to it but it's also got this feel I can't recognize

Krafty: I've got to say I'm really impressed. What's good about Thailand is it's new and it's fresh and there's so much to do. The food is amazing. Dominic is in heaven with the chilis. And the people are really friendly; we feel very welcome. I've been to Koh Samui a couple of times and there's some brilliant parties there, but this is my first time in Phuket. I haven't had a good chance to take in everything during the day, but it looks very beautiful, and the place that I'm staying at Sri Panwa is just completely the most idyllic place that I've been to in my life.

Gazette: Where are your favorite party scenes around the world?

Dynamite: I'm blessed to have seen so many places. I mean a good London party, a good UK

party, you can't beat it. But I love playing in Rio de Janeiro, Serbia, New York, Tokyo, Puerto Rico, the list goes on and on. I think as long as there's good energy in the room, and I'm doing what I'm supposed to do, the DJ's doing what he's supposed to do and the people are doing what they're supposed to do, that's a cocktail for success and you can get that anywhere.

Gazette: Is touring always fun? Krafty: Always. When I work with Dominic, it's like a meeting of two minds; there's loads of creativity and it's good because we roll off each other. We don't work together all the time, and that's what makes it good because we enjoy it when we see each other and play together and it brings a lot of nice energy.

Gazette: What projects are you working on at the moment?

Dynamite: We're working on Krafty Kuts' new album – we've done some music together, and we've got plenty more we're going to do – it's going to be a huge album. I've got the new Roni Size/Reprazent album that's coming out, and I've got two albums I'm doing myself: a hip-hop "Dynamite" project and a soul album under a different name. *Gazette:* Is that your first soul

Dynamite: Yeah it's my first ever soul project, I'm producing it and singing. It's just something I wouldn't say I've always wanted to do but always knew I would do when I got to the right age, feeling and energy levels. I've

played tracks to quite a few

people and I'm getting really good feedback. I figure there's gonna be some exciting music next year, in a time that maybe exciting music is slightly lacking.

Krafty: There's a lot of things happening within the music industry and these are difficult times, but difficult times can bring good things, because they bring out the creative side of the really strong people involved in the music industry.

Gazette: Why do you say these are difficult times?

Krafty: The economy's taking a tough time, so basically less people are traveling and less people are spending money, but entertainment will always be there, whether you have comedy, music or reading books or watching TV, we'll always need to be entertained. In the next few years you will see some incredible music from people like Roni Size and Dynamite, and people from hip hop, house, drum'n'bass, wherever. What goes down must come up.

Gazette: Tell us about the new Krafty Kuts album.

Krafty: Well, I've got Dynamite on quite a few tracks, which is really exciting. He's a brilliant MC and the most positive person I've ever worked with – and I'm not saying that because he's here – but he's very professional and I love that. We both push ourselves to the limits to get the best of what we can do and I feel that 2009 is going to be our year, on tour and musically. Mavado, "So Special", Usher, "Love in This Club" (amazing record), Wiley, "Wearing my Rolex" – fantastic record. There were a lot of good things - some of them overground, some of them underground. I'm really looking forward to '09. I love the new year because there's so much potential. You feel like there's a blank canvas once again. Whatever you did wrong last year, you can do right this year. Whatever tune you made last year, this tune you're going to make better, and I like that. Music only ever gets better. Even when it gets worse over there, there's someone over here making it sound better. So you're gonna have some great stuff to write about, without a doubt, there's gonna be some great parties to go to. It's all positive till it's negative. And when it's negative, it's over.

Gazette: And finally: what are your musical guilty pleasures?

Dynamite: I do the chart show on Kiss every Sunday, it's a national show, a million listeners. It introduces me to music that I wouldn't normally listen to. I like Pink. She's my guilty pleasure. She's got fire. I feel like if she was sat here right now we'd have a good time.

Krafty: I don't have any guilty pleasures. My guilty pleasures are probably wack movies sometimes, really cheesy, crappy movies. I got some girly flicks this year, like PS I Love You and some crazy stuff like that, that I actually quite enjoyed and I thought, why not? I'll go for that stuff, and it opened my world to a new experience. Whatever.



The General of Jungceylon

t is now more than two years thority of Thailand. since the imposing Jungceylon shopping center opened its doors to the general public in Patong. Under the helmsmanship of marketing guru turned CEO Prawit Janyasittikul, the Singapore-owned übermall only came into being second time of asking, after the project had to be put on hold in the wake of the 2004 tsunami.

Mr Prawit cut his teeth in the retail business, working for 20 years in the marketing department of Central Pattana in Bangkok, before signing up for the task of bringing the Jungceylon brand to the island in 2006. By his own admission, the birthing process has passed pretty smoothly, with the feedback from the island's residents and tourists being for the most part positive. "People in Patong tell me that Jungceylon has injected new life and color back into the town and given it back its smile," he says.

Mr Prawit manages the sprawling shopping complex with the help of a staff of 124, while his inner circle comprises a team of 16 managers, 9 based in Jungceylon and 7 in Bangkok. These days, Mr Prawit himself spends a good deal of his time in the capital, citing the importance of maintaining relationships with the company's important business partners, such as the Tourist Au-

Of the recent economic and political upheavals that have wreaked such havoc on the country's business community, Mr Prawit remains particularly sanguine. Indeed, he contends that the recent blockade of Bangkok's Suvarnabhumi airport by the People's Alliance for Democracy actually served to boost Jungcevlon's bottom line, highlighting the numbers of tourists "trapped" on the island during the siege of the kingdom's international travel hub.

Always on the lookout for new ideas to enhance and enliven his customers' shopping experience, Mr Prawit has lined up a number of new initiatives for Jungceylon in 2009. Just such a project is the forthcoming "Sunshine Smiling at Jungceylon" promotion, an example of what Mr Prawit coins "Retail Entertainment" and one which is designed to reinforce the island's connection to "sand, sea and sun". Having got the idea for the promotion from the recent "Smiley in the Sky" phenomenon that graced the Phuket night sky, Mr Prawit plans to unleash his "feelgood offensive" with slogans such as "Smiling Price, Smiling Service, Smiling Country".

Also registering high on the fun-ometer will be "Bikini Day", to be launched over the Chinese

New Year period. Customers spotted wearing a bikini (girls or boys, we are led to believe) will be eligible for prizes, including free food. By providing a fun experience for tourists - an important segment for Jungceylon, accounting for around 60% of its shoppers – Mr Prawit sees direct benefits for his business.

However, for all his creative flair, Mr Prawit never loses sight of the need to marry marketing theory with business practice. "Many people are blessed with great creativity, but combining creative thinking with effective business application is often the hard part," he comments.

When not overseeing the Jungceylon empire, Mr Prawit likes to relax at the family home near Kasetsart University in Bangkok. 



Cajun Swordfish (for 1 person)

Swordfish steak 180g
Mashed potato 100g
Lime-tomato salsa 2 tablespoons
Guacamole 1 tablespoon
Plain yogurt 1 dollop

Chili oil to cook with and garnish

Salt and pepper to taste Coriander for garnish a sprig

Cajun seasoning

White peppercorns 2 tablespoons Black peppercorns 2 tablespoons 2 tablespoons Cayenne pepper Garlic powder 1 tablespoon Onion powder 1 tablespoon **Dried thyme** 2 teaspoons **Dried mustard powder** 1 teaspoon **Ground fennel** 1/2 teaspoon 1/2tsp Dried oregano Ground cumin 1/2tsp

Cooking Instructions

Place the spices in a suitably sized vessel and grind finely together. Sprinkle salt and pepper on both sides of the swordfish steak and then repeat using the Cajun seasoning. Pour the chili oil into a heavy-based pan and cook the swordfish over a low heat until brown on one side. Turn the steak over and repeat before finishing in the oven for five minutes.

Serve with mashed potato, lime-tomato salsa and guacamole. Garnish with the plain yogurt, chili oil and a coriander leaf.

MONEY TALKS

he new US President Barack Obama may well bring some relief to financial markets. It is constructive that he assumes power with US\$350 billion in cash at his immediate disposal.

These funds come courtesy of his predecessor, George W Bush, who held the power to distribute this amount of money under the Troubled Asset Relief Program (TARP). The outgoing president was co-operation personified with the new commander in chief. He simply offered the funds which had become available and it was to America's great benefit that both parties worked smoothly together.

President Obama, while still President-elect, made it clear there could only be one President of America at any time. This was a clever and laudable announcement and the two men seem to have reached a very accommodating working relationship. The balance

of the new stimulus plan, which is anticipated to be US\$775 billion, will hopefully be available by mid-February.

In financial terms this puts a "floor under the market". The US government is able to assist the economy by acting as a buyer in the market, for example by creating demand for out-of-favor assets i.e. mortgage backed securities. This demand can change a whole market's attitude.

A recent example, albeit from Germany, may be illuminating. In late 2008 Porsche decided to stage a takeover bid of fellow car maker, Volkswagen. The latter's shares were languishing along with those of virtually every other member of the industry.

The sudden demand for Volkswagen shares from Porsche temporarily made Volkswagen the most valuable company in the world until the takeover was completed.

Another factor which enters into the equation is the "honey-moon" period, which traditionally lasts for around 100 days for an incoming president. This can also act as a fillip for the markets. A view that could almost be described as the consensus is that the first two quarters of 2009 will be extremely unpleasant but will then improve.

Consensus views scare me because they are seldom correct.

This recession, insofar as it is being propelled by a financial crisis, promises to be far more complex

than previous recessions.

One example of this complexity is the latest available data for US import and export prices for late 2008; both reflect strong deflationary trends.

It is likely that, at this stage, all the stimulus packages being administered around the world are addressing an environment which is either outright deflationary or heading in that direction. Unfortunately, this is more a reflection of a collapse in demand leading to lower prices than would be the case in more normal times.

Oil prices, at only a fraction of where they were just months ago, mean that consumers have extra money to spend. So although US retail sales over the vital De-

cember period reflected negative figures, there is still data yet to be published as it does not yet take into account the effects of discounted prices by retailers. Some analysts believe that once the discounting effects are added to calculations, actual sales may well be equal to December 2007.

We still appear to have some way to go with this crisis; the announcement by US banking group Morgan Stanley that fellow banking giant HSBC may be required to raise US\$30 billion in equity capital shows that even extremely well-managed groups, and HSBC certainly qualifies as one, are still feeling the effects of this crisis.

Economic conditions in Europe are grim, with the German economy, the largest in the region, deeply mired in recession. In mid-January, the European Central Bank (ECB) was forced to reduce its base lending rate by 50 basis points from 2.5% to 2%. The ECB has been notoriously slow in reducing rates but even they have been forced to face reality.

Japan, the world's secondlargest economy, has just reported a virtual collapse in machinery export orders; the expression "falling off a cliff" is very apt.

Recessions, in the best of times, if that is not an oxymoron, always cause banks'bad debt levels to rise. This recession promises to be well above average in this respect. Against this backdrop, it was not surprising that 2008 was an 'annus horribilis' for most investors. Hedge funds, both "long" and "short", were common areas where losses were made. This does not, however, implicate all hedge funds, as some of the astutely managed funds did return significant profits. Another area, able to invest on both a long and short basis, is managed futures funds.

This column has periodically covered this area, notably three different funds from AMT Futures, a London-based asset manager with years of experience. All three funds performed well in 2008 and returns, although below average, ranged from 11% to over 15%. The important point is that in a very hostile environment, investors still managed to make money.

I shall soon be meeting with a senior executive associated with the group and the next article will carry much more technical information on these funds, including the IQ-A program, now an integral part of the IQS and SAV Funds.

Warn travelers of smuggling risks

The campaign by the Department of Intellectual Property (DIP) using billboards to warn travelers at Bangkok's Suvarnabhumi Airport of the stiff penalties they face if caught bringing counterfeit goods into foreign countries is not only commendable, but overdue.

Given the scale of the trade in counterfeit goods in Phuket and the number of direct international flights out of Phuket International Airport (PIA), the *Gazette* recommends that the DIP extend the campaign to PIA as soon as possible.

While this editorial writer finds it odd to be arguing in favor of billboards, the DIP signs carrying vital warning messages are worthwhile if they prevent even just a few travelers from having to pay huge fines – or possibly even serve jail time – for unknowingly "smuggling" counterfeit goods into countries like France, where IP laws are not only strict – but strictly enforced.

The Gazette agrees that those involved in the manufacture, wholesaling, retailing and intentional high-volume smuggling of counterfeit products across borders certainly deserve harsh penalties. However, holidaymakers unaware that the designer handbag they bought in Patong is a fake certainly do not.

Like his predecessors, Phuket Governor Preecha Ruangjan has asked police to crack down on the sale of counterfeit goods. Yet the trade continues more briskly than ever, with the local cost of highquality pirate DVDs now down to just 50 baht a copy from 100 baht

Not only is the counterfeit goods trade carried out in full view of police, but it is conducted in large part by foreigners of dubious immigration status who make a mockery of laws restricting retail work to Thai nationals. Even worse, their incessant and annoying "sales tactics", which include physically accosting passers by, have done untold damage to the island's reputation over the years.

The DIP website presents figures showing progress in the fight against copyright infringement and credits the Royal Thai Police and DSI for making 7,118 arrests nationwide in IP cases in 2007, up from previous years.

While this may represent "progress", the number of arrests remains minuscule compared with the actual scale of this illegal industry. Without a sea change in the way Thai law enforcement chooses to enforce IP law, the DIP is as far away as ever from meeting its goal of bringing Thailand up to the standards of more developed countries

In the meantime, the effort to prevent foreigners from getting into trouble when returning abroad with counterfeit goods is money well spent. -The Editor



Preserving gentle giants of the sea



FIRST PERSON

Robyn Hasson is a diving instructor from the US. Falling in love with diving prompted Robyn to quit her job and move to Koh Tao, where she began to accumulate the necessary dive qualifications to become a PADI- and

SSI-certified instructor. The former marketing and public relations representative is now a partner at liveaboard operators Wicked Diving in Khao Lak; specifically responsible for marketing, environmental policies, events and conservation and education programs. There are a total of four partners at Wicked including founder Paul Landgraver (USA), Marcel Bruijs (Dutch), and Filip Vandevyvere (Belgium). Fiercely determined to protect the world's marine ecosystems, Robyn spoke to the Gazette about Wicked Diving's forthcoming Whale Shark Exploration and Education project.

f you ask a diver, "What do you want to see while diving?", at least one of the top three answers is "a whale shark". When I started diving I had no idea what whale sharks were, or where you could see these amazing fish – until my 40th dive, which came at Chumphon Pinnacles, about 45 minutes from Koh Tao in the Gulf of Thailand.

As people jumped in for the morning dive, from the back of the boat we heard an instructor yelling "whale shark!" Everyone got kitted up and jumped in. There it was: a five-meter whale shark. If I hadn't been breathing through a regulator my jaw would have dropped. What a magical experience; what an amazing sight.

This started my personal fascination with the largest fish in the sea – and here at Wicked Diving, we all share these passions and fascinations. This is the primary reason for the creation of the Whale Shark Exploration and Education Program.

Graceful, rare, and mesmerizing, the whale shark can grow up to 12.2 meters long, weigh upwards of 13.6 tonnes and can live for about 70 years. Among the most elusive fish in

the sea, it is found in warm tropical waters and is believed to have originated 60 million years ago.

Currently listed as a vulnerable species by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), the whale shark is frequently targeted by commercial fisheries in many regions. Little is known about this magnificent fish – and even less about its mating habits, migration patterns and size of population.

The staff at Wicked Diving have seen our fair share of whale sharks. Even so, we appreciate how rare these sightings are. Filip Vandevyvere, partner and instructor from Wicked, has over 1,200 logged dives and has worked in the diving industry in Thailand for over seven years. Despite this, he only saw his first whale shark in Koh Tao this past

Seven years is a long time to wait, but it also proves how rare and special these fish are, and how lucky anyone is to see

We are fortunate to live near and dive in an area known for frequent whale shark sightings, the Similan and Surin Island National Marine Parks.

There have been multiple whale shark sightings this season - mostly at Richelieu Rock, but also off Koh Bon, Koh Tachai, BonSoong Wreck, and around Island Nine (Christmas Point) in the Similans. More sightings have been reported so far this season than in last year's entire season.

The same is true for manta rays, with consistent sightings at Koh Bon during the first two weeks of January. They have also been spotted recently at Koh Tachai, Richelieu and around Similan Island Nine, Island Seven (West of Eden), and further south around Boulder City and Shark

I'm proud to be able to offer specialized programs like the Whale Shark Exploration and Education trips, which go in search not only of whale sharks, but also manta rays and other larger pelagics.

The primary goal of these expeditions is to see and dive with whale sharks and manta rays, participate in the ECOCEN digital photographic library for tracking, and to educate the participants on the biology and known information about these magnificent creatures.



We also include a specialty certification from SSI (SSI ECOLogical) on these trips that focuses on diving skills and elements like perfect buoyancy, reef clean-ups, shark biology as well as Naturalist and Underwater Fish Identification.

All of these components are targeted at creating more educated divers with an awareness of the surroundings they dive in, an appreciation of rare species and the motivation to do what they can to preserve them and the habitats that sustain them.

For the 2009 season, Wicked Diving and Golden Buddha resort have teamed up to support continuing efforts aimed at whale shark education, preservation and exploration. There are two periods when people can take part in these expeditions: February 4-6 and March 3-8.

The February excursion includes a minimum of nine dives (Richelieu Rock, Surin Islands, Koh Tachai, Koh Bon, and BonSoong Wreck) with experienced and qualified dive guides and instructors leading to SSI **ECOLogical Specialty Certifica-**

The proceeds are donated back into local environmental programs; educational presentations on whale sharks, other sharks, manta rays and local marine life; scuba equipment; all meals and beverages; underwater digital cameras and instruction.

There will also be a videographer on board, recording the trip and the dive, with a DVD available for purchase.

y mother was born in Thailand, is a Kong on January 30. Thai national but Kong after getting married and has lived there ever since.

She has a brother in Bangkok, however, my mother's name has not been on the house registration certificate (tabien baan) since she moved away and her Thai passport has been out of date since 1997.

The Thai Consulate in Hong Kong has told my mother to return to Thailand to apply for a new ID card and passport. Before doing that, she has to add her name to the tabien baan.

She has already booked a return ticket to fly from Hong Kong on to Bangkok on January

I am worried that one week she moved to Hong is not enough time to complete all that paperwork, including having a new passport issued. She only has a one-way permit to enter Thailand, so if she doesn't get the new passport in time, she will not be allowed back into Hong Kong.

> Please can you tell me if she will be able to add her name to the tabien baan and how long it will take if she can do so?

> Will she then have time to apply for her new ID card and passport?

Reply from Talang District Office:

The first thing your mother should do is make sure that her name is still registered with the Department of Provincial Registration (www.dopa.go.th).

This shouldn't take long if she goes first thing in the morning, but it could take all day if there are any issues with her current documents.

However, having this confirmation in hand will help speed up the process for the other documents as she will be able to prove that the papers she carries now are genuine.

Your mother should then be able to register her name on the tabien baan and apply for her new ID card on the same day.

Once she has completed those tasks, she can then apply for her new passport.

One week should be enough time to get all the documentation she needs. Any delays will be due to the place your mother was originally registered on the tabien

If she was registered in another province, then she will have to go to that province's district offices to re-register. She should contact that office by telephone first to save time when she arrives in Thailand. If you don't know the telephone number of the office, you can call 1133.

Last glimpses of the gentle orangutan

drove through palm oil plantations for three hours to reach Bukit Lawang, outside Medan in Sumatra, the closest location to Phuket where you can still see wild orangutans. My goal was to photograph the "red apes" before they become extinct.

A scientifically credible genetic study released in 2006 says the outside estimate for these animals becoming extinct in the wild is about 20 years. The reason:

habitat loss due to agricultural conversion writ large by the endless palm oil plantations of my journey.

Palm oil, extracted from the fruit of the oil palm, is extremely rich. As well as producing a high yield in biodiesel conversion it is used in the manufacture of numerous household products including soaps, cosmetics, chocolates and transfat-free cooking

oil. One in every 10 products in a modern supermarket contains palm oil. Combine that fact with the huge demand for biodiesel and a weak, corrupt government and nature doesn't stand a chance.

Ironically an EU environmental mandate for conversion to petrol/diesel mixes with at least 10% biofuel appears to be the final blow for the orangutan. After the mandate, jungles in Sumatra and Borneo were decimated to produce palm oil for biofuels. So much green house gas is released in deforestation and the subsequent agricultural fires, that a plantation requires a century of production to offset those original green house gases – not including the transportation required to get the palm oil to market. With luck, palm oil trees may be productive for one-third of a century.

But palm oil production isn't the only threat to orangutans and their environment. Long-time Phuketians will remember the great fires across Indonesia and Malaysia during 1997-98. We were told they were "agricultural fires", with the blame pinned on small-time farmers clearing their ancestral lands in traditional Asian fashion to plant crops.

In fact, they were major industrial fires started by Malaysian logging companies (with a little assistance from the Indonesians) who were granted concessions from the corrupt Indonesian gov-

ernment. Several million hectares of rainforest were cleared at a rate equivalent to three football pitches every minute.

Everybody in Singapore and KL was complaining about the smog and the entire peninsula was reminiscent of Los Angeles before catalytic converters. Tensions rose between KL and Jakarta until it was discovered

that Malaysian logging interests were behind the fires, not poor local farmers!

Suddenly, complaints from KL stopped. Malaysians know that 80% of worldwide rainforest extraction is by Malaysian-owned companies – and they're ruthless.

In the decade after the fires - which brings us to today - orangutan populations dropped 43%. A recent census shows about 20,000 orangutans remain, down from 35,000 in 1996. Estimates put the number of Sumatran orangutans (Pongo abelii) at around 6,600 in 2004. Now it appears the orangutan will become the first Great Ape to become extinct in the wild – thanks to mankind's newfound "environmental" concern.

Humans abuse those closest to us. Nations war with their neighbors, domestic violence is rampant, David Madoff preyed on other Jews. In Southeast Asia, humans shoot mother gib-

bons to capture their babies. I've often wondered what we'd be like had we descended from the orangutan or mountain gorilla, rather than the ancestor of chimpanzees and bonobos – unruly, warlike and carnivorous. Conversely, the orangutan is an intelligent, gentle, loving vegetarian. Orangutans share 95-97% of their genetic material with humans – too bad we aren't more like them.

One sign of advanced orangutan intelligence is "calculated reciprocity", a fancy way of saying, "you scratch my back, I scratch yours." Researchers from Scotland's St Andrews University studying Bim and Dok, a pair of orangutans at Germany's Leipzig Zoo, discovered the mates displayed this kind of behavior. "It's not just humans that calculate about giving, and it's not just humans who expect to be given something in return when they are co-operative," claims Dr Valerie Dufour. "Orangutans do that too."

Experiments aside, I'm big on eye contact to measure animal intelligence. In Bukit Lawang I came close to a female orangutan and her baby. I looked into the mother's eyes, and the depth of pure parental love I saw was breathtaking.

The palm oil plantations surrounding Medan used to be Sumatra's legendary thick jungles orangutan habitat. A century ago, those jungles were thick and pristine. Then globalization hit and the rape began. Now the canopied jungles are being bulldozed and cleared by agricultural fires, several hundred four-wheel drive breaking up orangutan families. vehicles in inventory, so we de-

Mothers running from the devastation are killed and captured babies sold to unscrupulous millionaires, flaunting their wealth gains by jailing juvenile orangutans.

Everybody loves the orangutan except the palm oil folks, but their plight first came home when I spoke at the 1996 PATA Ecotourism Conference in Balikpapan. Borneo. Transiting Jakarta, I experienced an insight into the problem when I was courted by a politically powerful billionaire. When I asked why he was entering ecotourism, he replied, "We exhausted all our logging concessions, but we have cided to run eco-tours."

Sorry jerk. All the money in the world won't buy you dignity. Unfortunately, this irresponsible fool has the money to buy logging and palm oil concessions from government officials. Neither side cares about the law or the environmental consequences as long as there is money to be made.

But there is hope. In the next column we discuss Willie Smits's experiment to reclaim rainforests from barren lands; ways to cut down on your palm oil consumption and the downsides of ethanol.



Nevertap contest makes Asian debut in Chalong

Andreas Hesselback from Sweden defeated Sebastian Desvignes via adjudication in the final to take the gold medal in the welterweight division.


Andreas, a Phuket resident, said, "I had to win four

With business looking rosy, Andara has plans to expand further afield. "We are looking to develop the Andara brand in other Asian countries. We will remain true to our designs wherever we go. At the moment there is an infatuation with Southeast Asian history and we try to incorporate that both inside and outside the apartments," Mr Gascoyne said.

Luxury villa market update II

s discussed last week, the upper end of the luxury villa market has outperformed Phuket property market as a whole, with many successful property launches despite political turmoil and global economic woes. In last week's column we drew upon recent market research to outline some trends in the luxury villa segment, defined as projects with units priced at 65 million baht and above. This week, we will take an in-depth look at some of the factors affecting supply and demand for luxury villas.

Looking forward

It is evident from the luxury villa pipeline that upcoming supply is expected to be limited in the next 12 to 24 months. This is due in part to global economic pressures that are likely to result in some projects being put on hold.

From the lending side, banks are withdrawing commitments to fund projects. Also, buyers are unable or unwilling to fulfill their obligations. In some cases, certain developers may be under cash pressure. While liquidity remains tight, we may see a slowdown in new project launches and progress on developments already underway.

We will likely see more Thai-based developers with access to debt servicing entering the market as opposed to institutional investment vehicles, which are temporarily squeezed. For those with capital (purchasers, investors or developers), there will be opportunities to benefit from any temporary softening.

Inflationary pressures on construction costs are easing due to decreasing energy costs and expected price stabilization for construction materials in the face of weaker demand. It is likely that well-capitalized developers could benefit from lower development costs and associated risks. As such, projects already launched or about to launch would appear to have a favorable jump start over the next 12 to 24 months.

Another supply issue relates to the availability and pricing of land in Phuket. The scarcity of prime beachfront and sea

view property, as well as robust land pricing levels, could also be a contributing factor to the slowdown in upcoming supply.

The shift to less costly parts of Greater Phuket is evident in the location of upcoming supply,

with the bulk of announced luxury villa projects to be situated along Phuket's east coast, as well as Mai Khao and Phang Nga. Examples of this trend include new entrants to the Greater Phuket market such as Taj Exotica on Koh Lone and Raffles in Phang Nga.

Demand

In terms of demand, when all of the figures are in, it is likely that we will see a softening in the second half of 2008 luxury villa sales and a weak start in the first half of 2009. This is mainly due to a "wait and see" attitude on the part of potential purchasers, who may be affected by the global financial shakeout.

While Thai political instability is often considered as a factor in reduced demand, we do not see this being a significant or long-term deterrent to potential buyers in the upper end of the luxury villa market. Discussions with real estate professionals in Phuket in-

dicate that while sales are being completed and the top-tier market continues to do relatively well, lower tiered product is facing more of a challenge in today's environment. This is largely due to over-supply and lower quality products at the lower price points. Conversely, the strength of the top tier segment can be attributed to demand drivers such as a shortage of prime sea view or beachfront property in Phuket, high quality concepts and finishes, and a small but exclusive supply of new developments.

Another valid reason for the continuing purchaser interest in the high-end villa sector is that

luxury buyers in Phuket are largely cash buyers, who may be less affected by the market fallout and liquidity problems. Moreover, Phuket's strong tourism industry

continues to bolster the residential market and this trend appears set to continue. Investment in the lodging market continues along with projected increases in tourist arrival figures. Thirty new hotels are currently at various stages of development, with nearly five thousand rooms due to be added to supply through 2011. Of the existing hotel inventory, about 25% (about 10,000 units) are of international-rated standard. As such, this additional inventory will increase total supply of such properties by 50% in a short period of

Villa sales issues

An interesting trend in Phuket is the change to the definition of "luxury villas", both in terms of pricing and location. As pricing levels push upwards, with an average price of 125 million baht in the top tier luxury sector, there is some discussion as to where "high-end" becomes "luxury" and which properties qualify. In the

past, the über luxury was benchmarked to Amanpuri, followed by a few select properties such as Trisara and Banyan Tree.

Now, however, the growing supply of properties coming online in the 100- to 200-millionbaht price range is re-defining the luxury landscape in Phuket. Another related change is in that most crucial aspect of any development: location, location, location. It used to be that the west coast with its "Millionaires Mile" in Kamala was the home of luxury in Phuket. However, with a growing high-end pipeline on the east coast with banner projects such as Jumeirah Private Island, Taj Exotica and the Philippe Starck/Jean-Michel Gathy collaboration at The Yamu, it is likely that the emerging landscape of "Phuket 2.0" is going to be a very different from its predecessor.

Pricing

There are several factors which should help sustain or further drive up price values in the Phuket luxury villa market. The following are among them:

Change in demographics

The Tourism Authority of Thailand has been very effective in opening up new tourism markets. Its current focus on increasing the number of visitors from emerging markets. Visitors from China, Russia, India and the Middle Eastern should allow Thailand – and Phuket's property market – to benefit greatly from shifts in global wealth distribution.

Arrival of the 'Super Tourists'

A major trend in the luxury travel market is the increasing impact of a group who have been termed as "super tourists" – conspicuous consumers of extremely high-end products. With the addition of a planned private jet airport, Phuket is positioning itself to be attractive to the extremely wealthy. Furthermore, recent upgrades to the marina sector mean that mega-yachts can presently be accommodated at three local marinas.

Yachting market

Phuket is becoming known as a boating destination. Its sheltered east coast is ideal for marina developments and is a logical access point to Phang Nga Bay. Given the sheer size of the global boating market and the value of boat slips and residential properties at marinas in other markets such as the Caribbean and the United States, this represents a valuable opportunity for developers in the region. At present, Phuket has four private marinas in operation – a figure which will increase to five when Jumeirah opens.

Boutique developments

The shortage of suitable land in prime areas has led to an increase in the number of small-scale developments – those with 20 or fewer units. Examples of this trend include Tamarind and Sava Natai. This trend is expected to continue as availability of land shrinks further.
