### Ministry of Foreign Affairs branches out to Phuket

PHUKET: Foreign visitors to the region and local expat residents will soon be able to take advantage of a local branch of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to be established at Phuket Provincial

Phuket Governor Preecha Ruangjan told the Gazette on January 30 that he had received confirmation that day to go ahead with plans to establish the Foreign Affairs center, which will offer a range of services similar to those provided at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs offices in Bangkok.

"The new Foreign Affairs branch should be up and running within three months," said Governor Preecha. "There is no need to undertake any construction to house the new center as it will be established in existing rooms at Provincial Hall. However, it will take a while to set up the offices with furniture and equipment, including computers that will be directly linked to the ministry's central offices in Bangkok," he added.

Governor Preecha said that the center is a much-needed addition to the province as the number of annual visitors continues to increase. "Phuket is recognized as one of the world's top holiday destinations and is an international hub for the region. The new center will help bring the island up to date in the eyes of foreigners," he said.

Representatives from the

Ministry of Foreign Affairs headquarters in Bangkok will be heading to Phuket to train local staff on a number of ministerial procedures. However. Governor Preecha was unable to confirm exactly when the center would be fully operational and offering the full range of services currently only available in Bangkok.

Once up and running, the center will be 'online' with the

ministry's offices in Bangkok. "This will enable foreigners to carry out ministry-related procedures and process documents in Phuket without having to go to the ministry's offices in Bangkok," he

Governor Preecha explained that the center will also be a venue for holding training seminars for businesses and individuals involved in the tourist

"It will be a place where we can learn more about the cultures of different nationalities in order to help us better serve the variety of foreign visitors that make up the tourist sector," he said.

The range of services available at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs typically includes consular affairs, such as the arrangement of visa and travel documents for Thai nationals, verification procedures for processing marriages between foreigners and Thai nationals, advice and authorization of naturalization procedures and legal advice.

### Solution in the pipeline for water-starved residents

PATONG: Residents of parts of more permanent basis. Patong who have gone without piped water for more than six months should see at least some improvement in supply by midmonth, when installation of a new water main is scheduled for completion.

Sayan Wareearoonroj, manager of Phuket Provincial Water Supply, told the Gazette that within three months the production capacity of problem-plagued Karon water desalination plant will be expanded from 7,000 cubic meters per day to 12,000 cubic meters per day, which should solve Patong's water woes on a

Around 10% of Patong's estimated 5,000 residences have been receiving less water supply than they need for the past six months, with many residences on Nanai and Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Roads receiving little or no wa-

While there is barely enough water to supply to Patong as things stand, these two streets lie upslope. A lack of water pressure has meant that some residences there have had to rely on truck deliveries for their water supply.

One angry reader wrote to the Gazette complaining that he

and his neighbors were spending about 30,000 baht a month collectively for water truck deliveries. However, he said he was still getting a water bill because air pressure was registering as water flow in his meter.

Mr Sayun said his agency nas spent more than 1 million bant on laying a new pipe from the main supply that runs along the length of beach road to the water-starved area, and that this work will be completed in mid-

However, the main problem is the lack of capacity of Karon's reverse osmosis desalination

plant. The plant, designed to produce 12,000 cubic meters of potable-quality water per day, has never produced more than 7,000 cubic meters.

Problems have included a lack of continuous power supply at the very high voltages required, as well as problems with the intake pipe out in Karon Bay during the monsoon season.

Mr Sayun told the Gazette that REQ, the company that built the plant, has commenced work on improvements expected to bring it up to full capacity within three months.

### Phuket Provincial Police Crime Stats January 2008/2009 comparison

**Murder:** There were five reports of murder (down 64% on the same period in 2008) with four arrests being made.

**Manslaughter:** There were 42 reports of manslaughter (down 6.67% from January 2008) with 27 arrests

**Theft:** There were 79 reports of theft (down 30.1% from January 2008) with 51 arrests. Reports of bike theft stood at 12 (up 50% from January 2008) with six arrests. A single car robbery was reported (down 75%) although no arrest was made. Reports of fraud and embezzlement totalled 13 with a solitary arrest.

**Gambling:** Statistics are divided into two categories: general gambling and illegal lottery: There were 65 cases of general gambling which resulted in 177 arrests (up 8.33% from January 2008), but there was a 15.38% decrease in the number of people arrested in connection with the illegal lottery (22).

**Drugs:** Arrests stood at 260 (up 111.65% from January 2008), from a total of 218 cases. Drug seizures for January were as follows: Dry marijuana: 425.19 grams, Krathom: (Mitragyna Speciosa): 1,171 leaves, 0.5 liters of extract, Ya bah: (methamphetamine) 9,853 pills, Ya Ice: (crystal methamphetamine) 52.82 grams, Alprazolam: (Xanax): 29 pills, Heroin: 0.198 grams Cocaine: 5.8 grams.

### **UV** lights to detect fakes


PHUKET CITY: In a bid to combat counterfeiting, Phuket Provincial Administration Organization President Paiboon Upatising has used his own money to buy 1,000 UV flashlights, which he distributed to vendors at two wet markets in Phuket City on January 23.

Mr Paiboon gave the devices away to traders at Kaset Market near Robinson department store, and at the Downtown Market on Ranong Road.

There have been a number of well-known counterfeiting cases in recent months, with fake 1,000-, 500- and even 20-baht bills being detected.

Wet markets are thought to be hotspots for the passing of fake bills. Criminals are known to favor the morning time – when light is poor and vendors are not as alert – as the time to pass on the fakes. Mr Paiboon's actions followed reports that some merchants at fresh markets were refusing to take 1,000 baht and 500 baht notes, fearing they might be fake.

"This is the Chinese New Year season. The flashlights are ang pao for the people," he said, referring to the custom of older people giving youngsters money in red envelopes at Chinese New Year.



### Police crackdown on illegal guns

PHUKET CITY: Owners of unregistered firearms will soon feel the full force of the law as part of an island-wide crackdown announced by Phuket Chief of Police Apirak Hongtong.

In a statement, released on January 31, Police Major General Apirak said that due to the current economic downturn, Phuket is faced with the risk of rising crime rates. To combat this threat he said he had instructed police officers to raise levels of inspections, particularly with respect to guns. This measure was being taken to pre-empt an escalation in the level of violent crime on the island, he added.

### Seaplane seeks to relaunch service

PHUKET: The Destination Air seaplane shuttle service whose license was revoked by the Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) has temporarily suspended all services until the company is bought out.

Destination Air Managing Director Pat James told the *Gazette* that the owners have four parties interested in buying the charter carrier. When one is chosen and the transaction is completed, the service will probably resume "intact", he said.

The new owners should be able to obtain the DCA license because the "political climate" that led to the license revocation

in the first place has changed, James added.

Resort owners at the south end of Patong Bay, where the Destination Air seaplanes were landing, cited safety issues and noise pollution when petitioning then-Governor Niran Kalayanamit to order the service to be stopped.

The order came in early April 2008, at the end of the high season, when the carrier was suspending the Patong service due to monsoon season conditions and the drop in tourists.

The company then had its license revoked for failure to comply with DCA requirements,

such as advertising scheduled flights on its website.

Mr James said the company website, which still advertises scheduled flights to Patong and other destinations in the region, will soon be suspended until sale of the company is complete.

Asked about competition from the recently launched Advance Aviation helicopter shuttle service, Mr James pointed out that seaplanes are a more economical option for tourists seeking a quick ride to resorts on outlying islands.

A seaplane can seat eight or nine passengers at a cost of US\$2,000 per hour. In comparison, it is roughly half the price of Advance Aviation's Phuket-based Europcopter EC130, which seats six passengers and has costs starting at about US\$2,000 for a half-hour flight.





# Heroines' Monument road system set for upgrade

SRISOONTHORN: Srisoonthorn Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*) has received a budget of 37 million baht to expand Heroines' Monument roundabout and improve roads in the area. Work is expected to start in late April.

Srisoonthorn *OrBorTor* President Thamrong Tantiwiwachakul said, "With Heroines' Monument located on the main road in and out of Phuket City, there are a large number of vehicles travelling past and there are problems with people walking across the road to pay homage to the monument. This means there are constant traffic problems."

The *OrBorTor* has been approved 27 million baht from the governor's office and 10 million baht from Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) to fix the problems, Mr Thamrong said.

Of the 27 million baht from the governor's office, some will be used to enlarge the roundabout and improve the surrounding landscape. The remainder will be earmarked for improving the road from the monument to Pa Khlok, including the construction of roadside drainage ditches, sidewalks and a rest area for motorists.

Ten companies have already taken out the bid plans, Mr Thamrong said.

The 10 million baht from the *OrBorJor* will be used to widen Srisoonthorn Road by six meters on each side, making it a fourlane road starting 500 meters from the monument.

Bidding will take place this month and work is expected to begin in late April, Mr Thamrong said.

### Epic struggle to raise sunken vessel

RAWAI: It took a week of strenuous effort, but the fishing boat *Sa-nguansin*, which sank off the coast of Racha Yai island on the evening of Sunday January 25, was finally raised and towed ashore to Cape Panwa on February 2.

In a tale of mixed fortunes, all 14 members of the crew survived the accident unharmed, though the boat's owner, Sanor Phopipat, now faces a bill for half a million baht's worth of repairs.

Meanwhile, villagers and fishermen on Racha Yai must have felt their luck was in when whole tuna fish started washing up on the island's pristine beaches on January 27 – the boat was carrying 5,000 to 6,000 metric tonnes of fish when it went down.

The *Sa-nguansin*, 3m wide by 12m long, was laden with sea perch, banana squid, mackerel and tuna when it was hit by three three-meter-high waves and strong winds at around 9 pm, causing it to capsize.

"It all happened so quickly. Our boat was engulfed by the waves. Parts of the boat broke off and then it sank," Mr Sanor explained.

The boat's crew jumped into the sea and were rescued by the fishing boat *Chokenattaporn*,

which was in the area at the time.

Mr Sanor estimated the cost of the damage at around 480,000 baht: 300,000 baht in damage to the boat's hull and fittings; 100,000 baht to replace the sonar system; 50,000 baht for the global positioning system; and 30,000 for the engine.

Mr Sanor said he was worried about how he would take care of his family now his livelihood had been destroyed: he is married with a son and daughter both still in school.

"I want to salvage the boat and borrow money to get it repaired. I need an organization to help me with the money because I am already one million baht in debt from before," Mr Sanor said before the boat was successfully raised.

"I feel so upset about the accident. I can't even eat, but I won't drink or smoke," he added.

On Tuesday January 27, 2kg tuna from the *Sa-nguansin*'s hold began to wash up on the beaches of Racha Yai, with the number increasing after midnight with the high tide.

Sophon Sukkarin, deputy chairman of a local environmental group, said, "They were found on beaches – Ter Bay, Plabpla Bay, Siam Bay and La Bay – around Racha Yai Island. There were 100 – 200 fish per beach."

Delighted that fresh tuna were washing up on their beach, fishermen and villagers collected them, but exposure to the sun meant they quickly began to decay and smell. "The smell disturbed tourists who swim and sunbathe in the area," Mr Sophon added.

Islanders eventually began to burn and bury the inedible fish, which were still being found on the beach on the evening of January 28.

Meanwhile, Mr Sanor and his crew were trying to salvage the *Sa-nguansin*. After an initial inspection of the site on January 26, the men returned the next day on a friend's fishing boat, the *Submari*, to try and raise the vessel, which was lying on the seabed, 30 meters below the surface.

The men tied a number of empty 200-liter oil drums to the boat and pumped them full of air in a bid to float the vessel. An insufficient number of oil drums, however, failed to raise the boat, which remained on the seabed.

They returned on January 28 and 29 but were once again unable to get the boat to float.

On January 30 they came back with reinforcements, in the form of a team of navy seals from the Royal Thai Navy Third Fleet, based at Cape Panwa.

Navy seal divers helped attach extra oil drums to the vessel, which was, by then, surrounded by dead fish. However, even 15 drums were not enough to make the vessel buoyant.

Junior Lieutenant Puttipipat Srijanboon, chief of the navy seal unit, said of his team's work that day, "It was all to no avail because we didn't have enough air in our diving tanks and we still didn't have enough information about the boat."

A fully equipped navy team would typically use special flotation balloons to raise a sunken craft, but the unit did not possess any. "The Royal Thai Navy Third Fleet has a limited budget for buying equipment like balloons and high-performance diving equipment that could help the navy seal team to work more effectively. If they had an international sponsor to support them, that would give them the opportunity to work and help people and foreigners in the Andaman Sea area," Junior Lieutenant Puttipat Srijanboon added.

On January 31, divers attached more than 30 oil drums to the vessel and were finally able to lift it off the seabed, though not all the way to the surface. Using a navy patrol boat, *Tor 220*, they attempted to tow the *Sa-nguansin*, but the rope broke and the attempt had to be abandoned as night set in.

Then on February 1 the Royal Thai Navy brought the warship *Ruea Luang Tongkaew* to assist the operation. Having successfully brought the *Sanguansin* all the way to the surface, the warship towed the vessel to within a mile of the Royal Thai Navy Third Fleet base at Cape Panwa before the tow rope snapped once again.

On the final day of the saga, with the *Sa-nguansin* too close to the coast for the *Ruea Luang Tongkaew* to continue, the *Submari* and *Chokenatta-porn* fishing boats towed the boat all the way to Cape Panwa, reaching the port at around 4 pm.

A hugely relieved Mr Sanor has already set to work repairing his boat.





### Airport expansion set for take-off

MAI KHAO, PHUKET: Government officers, airport officials and representatives of a consulting firm met on January 29 to discuss progress on the three-month environmental impact assessment (EIA) now underway on the planned 5-billion-baht expansion of Phuket International Airport.

The meeting, held at Thalang District Office, was opened by Phuket Airport Director Wicha Nernlop and Phuket Vice Governor Worapoj Ratthasima.

Maj Kamon Wongsombun, director of the Airports of Thailand (AOT) Development and Planning Division, started off with an overview of the project, work on which is set to begin in early 2010 and finish in 2014.

The expansion, which would increase the airport's passenger transit capacity to 12.5 million passengers per year, has been divided into four main work groups.

Group one work involves building a new parking area for planes away from the main terminal, doubling the number of taxiway lanes from four to eight, as well as expanding refueling

and other aircraft service and maintenance facilities.

Group two work involves design and construction of a new 52,000-square-meter international terminal with capacity for 5 million passenger annually.


The existing terminal will be redesigned as a domestic terminal capable of serving 7.5 million domestic passengers annually.

The international terminal will be located to the west of the existing terminal, in the area currently occupied by airport office buildings and warehousing.

Group two work also includes construction of a replacement 4,800-square-meter operations and office building and multistorey parking garage with spaces for 1,000 vehicles. These facilities are scheduled to open in 2012 under the plan.

Group three work involves construction of another 5,000square-meter multi-purpose building to the east of the existing terminal to house new offices, warehousing and other facilities.

Group four work, in the area currently occupied by the main parking lot, involves construction of new access roads, a small electric sub-station, new water

supply plant, waste collection and wastewater treatment facilities.

The work is essentially the


same as originally announced in May last year, though plans to expand the existing 3,000-meter runway to accommodate safe takeoff of fully laden jumbo jets have been scrapped.

Nitcharee Promwisuttipon, project manager of Bangkokbased SEATEC Consulting Engineers, who are conducting the EIA, said the three-month study will be concluded by the end of March.

Funded at 1.3-million baht, the EIA includes assessment of the project's impact on a variety of areas, including air quality, sound levels, water quality, aquatic ecology, land use, transport, public utilities and waste management.

Effects on the local community will also be considered, with public hearings and public relations work due to take place before work begins on the airport's expansion.

When the study is completed in March, a meeting will be held and recommendations to minimize negative environmental impacts will be suggested.





### Luxury charter helicopter service launched in Sakoo

SAKOO, PHUKET: Phuket's super-rich take note: the island now has its own luxury charter helicopter service ready to fly VIP tourists and businessmen to luxury resorts in the Andaman region.

Advance Aviation launched its Phuket service from its brand new helipad in Sakoo on January 9, flying about five flights during its first month in operation.

Vice Chairman Chai Nasylvanta said the company's first aircraft, a 4.5-million-baht Eurocopter EC135, was delivered in January, 2008.

The company now operates its second aircraft out of Phuket, a single-engine Eurocopter EC130 in "VIP configuration", with six passenger seats and one for the pilot.

The Advance Aviation helipad is located on a 28-rai plot of land on the old airport road. Total investment in the Phuket base was about 90 million baht, including the purchase of two Chanote title deeds and infrastructure including the helipad, a hangar and offices.

The investment was the company's first venture into the south of Thailand. Advance Aviation also operates a fleet of private jets out of Bangkok, catering to corporate clients like Siam Commercial Bank, PTT and Canadoil.

In total the company ordered four aircraft from Eurocopter, with which it has established a regional maintenance and repair center in Bangkok near Suvarnabhumi Airport. It expects to take delivery of the third and fourth aircraft over the next two years.

Two Eurocopter mechanics will also be based at the Phuket base and 14 more in Bangkok, with staff rotating between bases as necessary. The sole Phuket-based pilot is Capt Burin Phongsuwan.

"The Bangkok base will undertake the servicing of Eurocopters not only in Thailand, but in the region – including the EC155 of HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn," he said.

For sales and marketing the company has entered into a cooperative agreement with the Helithai company, which used to operate its own helicopter service in Phuket a few years ago, to negotiate contracts with luxury resorts in the region. Helithai, run by Frenchwoman Frederique Salti, also has staff based at the Advance Aviation base in Sakoo.

Advance Aviation is the only helicopter charter aimed exclusively at the VIP market, though it will also fly passengers needing medical treatment – but only if they are in stable condition.

Ownership is by Mr Chai and one other partner, who have 270 million baht in registered capital at 100% equity, with no bank borrowing.

Mr Chai said he started the company almost by accident as a service for his father, Privy Councilor Chaovana Nasylvanta, who lives in Sri Racha district of Chonburi.

As a Privy Councilor, Dr Chaovana has regular Tuesday audiences with HM The King, who spends most of his time at his palace in Hua Hin.

"By car it takes four-and-ahalf hours, but by helicopter it's only 35 minutes across the Gulf. Initially we bought the first helicopter for my father to use on Tuesdays. We chartered it out on other days to recover some of the costs, but it turned out that the market was so good that we decided to make it into a business," he said.

Asked if the company had ever provided transport for His Majesty, he said, "No, no, no. HM The King has a bigger helicopter that the government provides. But we did have David Rockefeller, who flew to Hua Hin a few weeks ago to have an audience with His Majesty."

The *Gazette* visit to the site on January 29 coincided with the arrival of the fourth charter flight using the Phuket helipad, with two passengers alighting from a flight booked by Six Senses Hideaway Yao Noi, in Phang Nga Bay.

Helithai handles resort clients and any new business outside the company's existing list of corporate clients.

The resort charters flights at

a corporate rate of approximately US\$2,000 (about 70,000 baht) for a half-hour trip, while the published rate is about US\$2,250.

As for competition, Mr Chai said there are only two other private firms operating helicopters in Thailand: Bangkok Hospital and Sri Chang, neither of which cater specifically to the VIP charter market.

Asked about competition from fixed-wing charter services, Mr Chai said it was his understanding that seaplane operator Destination Air was no longer in operation in the region as their license had not been approved by the Department of Civil Aviation (DCA).

Advance Aviation has been granted a helipad operator's license from the DCA for the Phuket helipad as well as a construction permit from Sakoo Tambon Administration Organization and another from the air traffic control body Aerothai, he said.

In addition to corporate charter, the service is offered on a walk-in, first-come, first-served basis. It generally takes less than an hour to get permission from the nearby Aerothai office to operate a flight, though night flights on single-engine copters are subject to a stricter process that takes up to about two days, he said.

Asked if they had to file an environmental impact statement on the noise made by the copter, he said it was not a requirement and that there had been no complaints about noise so far and that the company has only flown during daylight hours. "This is the quietest helicopter of its size in the world. In Bangkok our helipad is right in the middle of a residential housing estate," he said.

Safety equipment includes a flotation device, similar to an airbag, that can deploy and keep the entire aircraft afloat for about 10 minutes after a water landing.

Passengers are also asked to wear non-inflated flotation devices for the duration of the flights, as most flights are over water to outlying islands. In the event of an engine failure, the rule of thumb is that a copter can glide though a process called "autorotation" about twice the distance of the height where the failure occurs.

As for landscaping the area, Mr Chai said he plans to grow *ya faet* (Vetiver grass), similar in appearance to lemongrass, to prevent erosion of the hillside behind the helipad.


















### Beauty's brat out on bail

in Bangkok on January 30 sentenced Kanpitak "Moo Hem" Pachimsawas, the son of a former Miss Thailand, to 15 years and two months in jail on charges of premeditated-murder for his aggressive driving that killed one and injured three others in 2007.

The penalty was reduced to 10 years and one month as the defendant had already paid some compensation to the injured.

Last July, Mr Kanpitak

BANGKOK: Phrakanong Court swerved his car onto a footpath near a bus-stop where many people were waiting for buses after he got into an argument with a bus driver, claiming that the bus hit his car and fled.

> In addition to the jail sentence, the court ordered Mr Kanpitak to pay compensation totalling about 3 million baht to three of his victims.

Mr Kanpitak's parents indicated that he has a mental condition and that cannot control himself when he is under a lot of stress. However, the court ruling read, "There is no solid evidence to back up the defendant's claim that his mental health problem led him into this violent action" The defendant committed the crimes because he has been spoiled".

Upon hearing the verdict, Mr Kananek said his son would appeal. The young man, now 22, has already been released on 5million-baht bail.

### Crackdown urged to halt student cyber-prostitution

BANGKOK: Colleges and universities should take action against students found to have engaged in "direct-sale" prostitution via social-network websites like Hi5, according to well-known academic Sukhum Chaloeysap of Suan Dusit Rajabhat University.

Some students are said to have touted sexual services on Hi5, which has links to more than 1,000 other websites that openly post students' pictures - many of them in uniform – and suggestive messages.

"Many students' part-time jobs have been affected by the economic slowdown, driving some to prostitution to earn extra money. Principals of colleges and universities should investigate and join forces to combat the illicit trade," said Mr Sukhum.

Meanwhile, Culture Minister Theera Salukpetch said the ministry would write to the ICT Ministry, Education Ministry, Social Development and Human Security Ministry and Royal Thai Police as well as Internet serviceproviders asking them to step up the watch for prostitution on the

He blamed the online stu-

dent sex trade on faulty values and overspending on luxurious and unnecessary items that drove young people to such lengths to get quick cash.

He called for strong families and proactive educational and religious institutions to counter the trend. "Direct-sale" student prostitution came to light when Thais abroad urged the Culture Ministry to investigate Thai students posting their pictures, vital statistics, universities and telephone numbers with a view to offering sexual favors in return for cash.

### Punishment possible in foreskin fiasco

SAMUT PRAKAN: An inquiry into a mistake at a clinic in Samut Prakan, where a young boy was mistakenly circumcised, determined that the people responsible could face up to two years jail and/or a fine of up to 40,000 baht, the Public Health Ministry said on January 27.

Dr Somyos Deerasamee, head of the Department of Medical Service, said the team looking into the malpractice claim found that miscommunication had resulted in the circumcision of the 12-year-old boy, who should have been treated for an abscess in his A fact-finding panel met with related agencies and agreed that the doctor at the clinic was at fault for not properly supervising the male nurse who carried out the procedure.

The ministry would submit the case to the Medical Council to consider punishment in relation to the professional code of ethics, he said.

The ministry also reported the case to the Nursing Council to consider punishment for the nurse, he added.

Meanwhile, the clinic would take care of the boy until his wounds healed and he grows up.

### Eight die in temple fair attack

NONG BUA LUMPHU: Eight people were killed and more than 100 injured when a man threw a hand grenade into a crowd at a temple fair on the night of January 31.

Sribunruang District Police Superintendent Thammachak Khongmongkhon said the bomb blast was caused by an M26 grenade that was used by a group of young men quarreling with another group.

Uthen Boonmee, 20, was arrested for hurling the bomb in the temple fair, while 31-year-old Somkid Wangsridee was arrested for possession of the grenade.


Mr Somkid said he bought the grenade from a friend in Loei's Phakhao district for 500 baht.

### Man survives shooting

chief was shot and injured in Rattaphum district on January 29. The gunmen fled the scene after the victim returned fire.

Chit Chairat, former chief of Village 13 in tambon Khuhatai, was shot once in the ribs while a second bullet grazed his head. Villagers took him to Haad Yai Hospital, where his condition was last reported as serious.

Witnesses reported that Mr Chit, 60, was driving back through Village 13 after having his blood pressure checked by a public health team that was visiting the area. On the way, he stopped by the side of the road, where two men were apparently having difficulty starting their motorbike.

SONGKHLA: A former village When Mr Chit asked if they needed any help, the pillion passenger pulled out a pistol and shot Mr Chit twice. Mr Chit then drew his 9mm gun and returned fire. The driver of the gunman's motorbike then sped off, leaving his accomplice behind.

The gunman fled on foot into a nearby Soi, where he stole a motorbike at gunpoint from 32year-old Ari Samabup and made his getaway - carrying gallon drums of latex belonging to Mr Ari with him.

This was the second attempt on Mr Chit's life following another shooting in Village 13 at the end of 2007. Police said that they believe the motive for the shooting was revenge.

### Fishy goings on in food aid purchasing

BANGKOK: Food aid distributed to people in the South contained cans of rotten fish, according to opposition Pheu Thai Party, which is alleging corruption in the scheme.

Pheu Thai Party spokesman Prompong Nopparit said on January 27 that he would hand samples of the allegedly rotten cans of fish, which were donated to people in Phattalung, to Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva for investigation.

Mr Prompong brought samples of the survival kits of the Social Development Human Security Ministry, which included canned fish under the brand Chao Doi, for reporters to have a look at. People who received the survival kits opened the canned fish and found that the fish was rotten, he said.

He also offered 2,000 baht to anyone in the room who dared to eat the fish. A number of reporters took up the offer, saying the fish tasted okay, but smelled

Mr Prompong said he was confident there was corruption involved in the special purchase of 20,000 survival kits, to be distributed to residents in flooded areas of Phattalung, Narathiwat, Yala and Pattani provinces.

The allegation broke in Phattalung, the first province to receive donations.

"The troubled people expected to get help but received rotten stuff. I want the PM to investigate," he said.

### Brutal double murder on city streets

NAKHON SRI THAMMARAT: After falling off their motorbike while being chased by a gang of youths, two young men were beaten and stabbed to death in front of many witnesses in the early hours of January 29.

The bodies of 27-year-old Chatchawal Chanasak and Khamron Thongrod, 23, were found approximately 50 meters apart on Bor Ang Rd in tambon Tha Wang just after 2 am. Both had been badly beaten and stabbed. Police found Mr Chachawal with a pocket knife still protuding from Muang district Police Superinten-

his back. A Yamaha Mio motorbike was lying next to the body.

Witnesses told police they saw Mr Chachawal and Mr Khamrong driving at high speed down the road, pursued by a gang of youths on motorbikes. Mr Chachawal lost control of the bike and crashed. The pursuing gang immediately stopped and set upon Mr Chachawal. Mr Khamrong got up and ran away, but was caught in a vacant lot nearby.

Nakhon Sri Thammarat

dent Phudis Narasing said a witness who saw the start of the incident told police that about 10 youths on five or six motorbikes were at a gas station filling up their bikes when Mr Chatchawal and Mr Khamron drove past and shouted an insult at them. One of the gang members said, "Shall we take them out? I've got the gear in my bag: quick, follow them," according to the witness.

The gang are a regular sight on the streets of Nakhon Sri Thammarat and police are now hunting for them, Col Phudis said.

### Gang of teenage robbers target local schools after expulsion

NAKHON SRI THAMMARAT: Police in Ron Phibun district arrested four teens on January 30 for a robbing spree of local schools, apparently motivated by revenge for having been expelled.

The arrests followed a tipoff that a gang of adolescents were congregating in a house in the middle of a rubber plantation in tambon Ron Phibun Village 14. When police arrived at the house they found more than 10 youths, all dressed in black, who immediately fled into a nearby rubber plantation. The officers managed to grab four of the gang, but the rest escaped.

Inside the house, police found computers, televisions and a number of other electrical appliances, all marked with the names of local schools. Seven motorbikes were parked outside the house.

The four youths, all aged 14 and 15, confessed that they had stolen the electrical goods from schools in the district, police said.

They all also admitted that one of the motorbikes was stolen from Nakhon Sri Thammarat City, but claimed the other six belonged to members of the gang.

All four youths had stars tattooed on their right hands.

Ron Phibun Police Superintendent Phakhaphol Thawitsri said the four detainees had been Matthayom two and three students at a school in Ron Phibun, but had been expelled.

"The worrying thing is that after leaving [school] they started a gang called 'black shirts, starred hands' as every member has to wear a black shirt and have a tattoo of a star on their right hand. The gang has targeted various educational institutes in Ron Phibun district. We believe that it is revenge for being expelled. The gang sold the goods they stole and used the money to spend on having fun," said Col Phakhaphol.

The detainees also tested positive for drugs so will be charged with both drug and theft offences, he added.



n my last article I highlighted the poor high season revenues for December, which were projected to continue, by and large, through January and February. After a burst of tourist arrivals and activity in Krabi mid-January, it seems business is returning once more to lower levels.

Many readers of the *Gazette* are dependent on foreign buyers; expat business owners, tourist industry employees and real estate developers: the economic downturn is affecting us all. In that article I pointed out the need for the government to address the economic suffering of both small and medium businesses, foreign and local, and to lighten the load being placed upon them by the tax and revenue authorities.

On January 20, the new government announced a stimulus package which provided some relief to tourist-related businesses.

The foreigner visa fee has been waived for three months, but that will probably only have a significant impact on the lower end budget traveler.

Measures that may be more beneficial to tourist-related businesses include a reduction of 50% in national park fees for three months – they should make it permanent – a 200% tax refund for expenses for domestic meetings and training seminars, a suspension of property tax for hotels and a reduction in electric tax guarantee fees by 50%; every little bit helps.

The reduction of the airport

landing fees will reduce costs for the airlines and chartered flights, which, hopefully, will be passed onto the customers and boost arrivals

The real estate industry, which has been quieter than a mouse, will continue to enjoy a reduction in the special business tax.

Mortgage income tax deductions have been increased, which will hopefully spur the domestic market. Small and medium businesses will also have their minimum level of tax exempt income raised from 60,000 baht to one million baht.

It is hoped these measures will provide some relief for businesses operating in Thailand, and it is heartening to see the new government taking a positive step in the right direction.

However, as we all know, the provincial authorities, such as the tax and revenue department, enjoy a fair amount of freedom in enforcing their powers. We can only hope they have the same caring spirit as the central government and reduce the pressure for additional tax revenues during a severe recession.

#### Tsunami remembered

On December 26, 2008, the Sriphong Phukaoluan Community Center in Krabi hosted the fourth anniversary tsunami memorial ceremony.

### A wine madness: German quality, South African prices, and feminine mystique

a man's profession; women made jam. "One cup of wine," quoth the Talmud, "is good for a woman; two are disgraceful; three demoralizing; four are barbaric." No longer: whole estates cannot contain their creativity in this field; the greatest wine-makers in the world are women.

It was Heidi Peterson

Barrett who made Napa Val- Rare• ley cult classic Screaming Eagle, the world's most expen-

sive wine; in Bordeau, Corinne Mentzelopoulos runs Chateaux Margaux, and Baroness Philippine de Rothschild, who controls Mouton-Rothschild and a slew of only moderately less esteemed growths, is the region's leading light and propagandist; in Burgundy, Anne-Claude Leflaive oversees the great Domain Leflaive; in Australia, Cullen Vineyards' Vanya Cullen led the way, being chosen as Wine Magazine's "Winemaker of the Year" in 2000; and in South Africa, Reni Hildenbrand is proprietor and winemaker at Hildenbrand Wine and Olive Estate.

Reni Hildenbrand? Unlike the others, Hildenbrand, from Stuttgart, is not linked to a famous winemaking family. "My mother is against alcohol," she said during an interview arranged by local wine and spirits importers Black Forest, so she studied architecture – but "my dream was to make wine".

Although she achieved financial independence, Hildenbrand found the price of vine lands in her home country more forbidding even than the price of their produce. "I could not afford a farm in Germany," she said, so instead "traveled the world", looking for a vineyard to purchase.

In the '80s Hildenbrand visited a client in South Africa and decided the place had potential. The wine was good; the Cape

ine-making used to be region had a long history of quality winemaking. But local industry was depressed because of an ill-judged quota system and international boycott - making vineyards quite affordable. In 1991 she found the vineyard of her dreams, the historic Rhebokskloof winery.

Located on sloping hillsides outside Wellington, just northeast of Capetown, the estate had been

farmed since 1698, and owned by the same family since 1825.

By Marque Rome The architecturally impressive wine cellar was built in 1853, the Cape Dutch-style manor house in 1796, and the estate was home to South Africa's first olive orchard, planted in 1893 by Piet Cillie, a scion of Rhebokskloof's owners, who brought the olives from California. The orchard is still there, and

> now contains 3,500 trees. Hildenbrand, as befits an architect, is nothing if not efficient. She tidied up the estate; installed new equipment; learned winemaking in South Africa and, in Tuscany, earned a certificate from ONOA, the Italian Olive Oil Council. "I am a certified olive oil taster," she boasted. "We make South Africa's only freerun olive oil." She teaches the subject in Capetown Hotel School - "Those chefs know nothing about olives," she said – and with Wendy Flanagan, Hildenbrand wrote the book "Olives and Oils in South Africa" (220 pages; Mirimba Press).

> Her efforts have paid off: in 2000 and 2001 she was chosen as South Africa's Female Farmer of the Year, and in 2006 her Wellington 2005 Chenin Blanc won top honors from the South African Terroir Wine Awards. The latter is nothing to scoff at: the aim of the competition is to recognize winemakers whose wine reflects the special charac

teristics of terroir in their sub-districts. Certified "wines of origin", alone, could enter, and only 12 wines from eight wine growing areas in the Cape region received certificates. It's not one of those competitions – ubiquitous in the wine trade - wherein each entrant receives a medal.

Hildenbrand's approach to winemaking is typical of many female winemakers – de-emphasis of oak. She ages only 40% of her wines in oak and, uniquely, uses mostly Hungarian rather than French or American oak barrels (actually the smaller "barriques"). "Hungary's climate is cold, so it's a slow growing process. Thus the oak has a very tight grain," she explained, "and the oak flavor integrates slowly into the wine. It doesn't hammer it." To reduce oakiness still further, she uses no more than 50% new oak. "Oak barrels were never intended to impart flavor," she insisted. "I'm not interfering with nature." She added that, to her, too many New World wines lack character because they are "too manipulated".

In the vineyard, Hildenbrand takes a semi-organic approach: "No artificial fertilizers – I use compost from my animals." She has adopted hundreds of unwanted livestock: goats, pigs, oxen, sheep, donkeys, chickens, rabbits and horses. "All are rescued, all are my friends, and I don't eat my friends." They also keep down the weeds.

She prunes vines "to get a low yield" but doesn't manicure the leaves - "That's interfering with nature" – and often ferments with wild yeasts. Still, she hasn't abandoned science altogether: "I do leaf analysis to see if there's a shortage or too much of something. Too much nitrogen makes leaves look great, but you'll have a problem. It can stop fermentation."

That would result in low-alcohol wine, which doesn't appeal to Hildenbrand. Her semillon, for example, is fermented with wild



yeast; golden as the sunset; redolent of minerals, earth, spices, bell peppers and dried apricots; it goes down sweetly – and weighs in at 14.5% alcohol.

Her shiraz - "Fellow winemakers say it is more like French syrah," she said – is fermented in open tanks on wild yeast, aged in Hungarian oak, unfiltered, deep purple, peppery, fruity and contains 14.65% alcohol.

Eschewing the hybrids (such as pinotage) and ersatz sherries that long made up the bulk of South African production, Hildenbrand concentrates on premium European varietals. Aside from the aforementioned chenin blanc, other wines in her line-up include wooded (13.99% alcohol) and unwooded (14.11% alcohol) cabernets; and wooded (13.8% alcohol) and unwooded (13.5% alcohol) chardonnays. Each is honest, forthright, and filled with character – just like the woman herself.

### Managing Thailand

As a footballer, Peter Reid has seen and done it all. He has won the English football league and the FA Cup with his hometown club Everton and was named the Professional Football Association's Footballer of the Year in the process. While in Phuket recently with the Thai national team for the King's Cup international football tournament, Reid talked with the *Gazette's* James Goyder about life after the Barclays Premier League.

eid's career, both as a player and a manager, has been forged in the furnace of England's top division and it was a major surprise when he was appointed as the new coach of the Thailand national team after a three-year absence from the game, but already Reid has shown signs of warming to the task.

He brought his Thailand team to Phuket in December for the AFF Suzuki Cup where they won all their group matches and were unfortunate to be defeated by Vietnam in the last minute of the second leg of the final in Bangkok. This month they returned to Phuket for the King's Cup held at the Surakul Stadium in Phuket Town which is starting to feel like home for the national team.

"We do enjoy Phuket and we play some good stuff here, I think it's important to get out in the provinces and we've been made very welcome here. It's a terrific place to come to and a good place to play football," Reid says.

Under his tenure, the national team has actually played more times in Phuket than they have in Bangkok and they clearly appreciate the fanatical support they enjoy here, "The atmosphere's fantastic and the people are fantastic and I would like to thank the supporters on behalf of the players," Reid commented after a recent match.

Reid resides in Bangkok for most of the year and is gradually settling in to life in the Kingdom, "I'm enjoying it very much here; it's a fascinating country and I'm enjoying the culture and being involved with international football here."

His family remains back in his native England but for Reid, this is just part and parcel of footballing life, "My family have been over here once or twice but I've been in football since I was 15, so I'm used to being away, it's not a problem for me. My daughter was born in July and I can count the number of times I've seen her on one hand. It's an occupational hazard I suppose, it's just the way it is," he says.

One of the advantages of working with the Thai national team for Reid is that he gets a lot of time to work with his players, for whom country commitments take precedent over those of their clubs. His English counterpart, Fabio Capello, by contrast, is lucky to get to spend more than a few days at a time with the highly paid superstars that make up his England squad. So does Reid think his job is easier than the England manager's?

"In some ways its easier because I get to spend so much time with the players but in some ways its more difficult in terms of trying to get more European

standard competition to get the players to improve."

While the English Premiership is hugely popular in Thailand, the Thai national league, in which most of Reid's players still perform, is relatively obscure, "I think the national league has got to improve. The top countries in the world have the top leagues; England, Italy, Spain. The Thai national league has got to improve to give the Thai national team a chance to improve."

Despite the lack of quality domestic football in Thailand, Reid does not appear to be missing the bright lights of the Premiership too badly, "You always miss certain things about England but I've really enjoyed it here, I think everyone who knows me, including my brother who's out here now, can see how much I am enjoying it."

He does admit to struggling with the language barrier and is forced to do all his communicating through a translator, "None of the players speaks English; it's a problem but I've got an interpreter and football language is universal. I can show them what I want on the training ground and I can demonstrate a lot of things. There have been a couple of problems when I'm trying to get messages across during games but we will overcome them."


Reid's appointment last year was made with the 2014 World

Cup in mind. Does he think that qualification is a realistic ambition for the footballing minnows such as Thailand? "2014 is a long way away but you've got to build. We've got a lot of young players, if you look at the squad there's a lot of players in their early twenties and mid-twenties and there's a lot of good young players coming through. It's going to be difficult but Asian football is getting stronger and stronger."

While players from other Asian nations, in particular South Korea and Japan, have gone on to play club football in Europe, the Thai players are still relatively unknown outside these shores. Reid does not think that a lack of talent is the problem,

"The players have certainly got the technical ability but we're just trying to build up body strength and core strength, it's something we're working very hard on. I've seen a lot of nationalities come into the Premiership and I think there are certain Thai players who could definitely handle it."

The hopes and expectations of a footballing nation rest on Peter Reid's shoulders. His playing legacy, as a tough tackling midfielder for Everton and England, is assured. Now he is hoping to cement his managerial legacy and upset the odds by leading Thailand to a World Cup for the first time in its history.





### **Bodyguard to the stars**

hen it comes to bodyguards, few are as qualified or as well respected as Mickey Brett, a man well-known to many of Hollywood's actors and actresses. While holidaying in Phuket recently, Mickey granted the *Gazette* an interview at the Millenium Resort in Pationg.

Standing barely six feet tall, Brett does not cut a particularly intimidating presence, but strike up a conversation and you soon have the unmistakable impression of a man very much in command of who he is and what he does.

Brett's journey to bodyguard celebrity began when, at a young age, he took an interest in martial arts. Training in many different techniques of unarmed combat, including Thai boxing, he quickly excelled and, as he got older, took on the role of instructor. Before long, he was approached by the military and was asked if he would teach unarmed combat to special forces divisions. His new job entailed him working with anti-terrorist teams in the UK, Russia, and even Afghanistan.

He started to work increasingly with members of various special forces teams as they left the army, and later on private con-

tracts with various governments.

His career as a bodyguard began with him mostly protecting government officials and Brett soon made a name for himself, which in turn brought him to the attention of a number of high profile people.

He gradually started to alternate between working for governments and people in the entertainment business. It was at this time that Brett caught the eye of a Hollywood bodyguard who at the time was working for actor Keifer Sutherland. The bodyguard asked Brett if he fancied traveling to Los Angeles to meet with Sutherland, to which he agreed. After a spell working with Sutherland, the star of TV's 24, he received a call from another agent, this time in the employ of Sylvester Stallone.

"...[The producer] Said Stallone had an American body-guard who wanted weekends off. I went to the studio to meet his current bodyguard and production manager. It went pretty well. They called me and asked if I could start next weekend. I said, 'sure'."

He later got a call saying that Stallone had changed his mind and wanted someone taller than six foot three. Brett said that he knew of a replacement but since the weekend was fast approaching, it was too short notice. After guarding Stallone that weekend, the star of Rocky and Rambo quickly had a change of heart. Having witnessed the way Brett worked, Stallone decided to keep him on. Brett's reputation grew, and he quickly became something of a celebrity among celebrities.

Since those early days, Brett has worked for the likes of Sandra Bullock, Robbie Williams, Tom Cruise and Nicole Kidman, Richard Gere and Cindy Crawford.

Brett is quick to point out that working with governments and celebrities is very different. "With government contracts, everything is already planned and laid out for you, you just gotta do your job and not miss a beat. With celebrities it's very different. You gotta do all the planning, make sure everything goes smoothly. Every detail is important, like planning the route, back up routes, getting cars to block roads just in case somebody notices a client, finding back-up entrances and exits from buildings. You gotta know what to do in case of an emergency. Its all quite stressful."

Brett said that being a bodyguard is very different from what people see in the movies. Employing the biggest guards does not mean you are going to be safe. "All those guys are good for is just shoving people off. They



don't know how to plan, how to handle things if it all goes off. You just can't rely on them," he said.

Bodyguarding is a very multi-faceted career. You not only have to know how to physically protect your clients, but also how to keep a cool head in an emergency. Basic paramedic skills are also a necessity. As Brett says, "You never really know what can happen, there are some crazy people out there."

When asked about the most exciting moment in his career, Brett mentioned a mob shoot-out in Russia.

Having established a name for himself, Brett is now regarded as one of the most sought after bodyguards in the business. As the voice of experience, Brett offers some advice to anyone who is interested in a career as a celebrity bodyguard.

"If you want to get into it just to be around famous people, then forget it. If that's your motive, then all it's gonna do is distract you. You are going to become a liability. You also better be prepared to give up your life. It's not just a full time job; bodyguarding becomes your life. You sell yourself to your clients. The reason I don't work full time any more is because I'm married. You are always working, no matter what. That's the kind of thing you have to be prepared for."

In terms of motivation, Brett stated the obvious. "Money! Dealing with high profile clients brings high profile compensation.

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

### Rise and shine with the sun



Welcome to the first installment in a new alternative-health feature entitled Yoga Moments. Content is provided by Dr Abhishek Agrawal, who runs Abbysan Yoga & Wellness Center in Phuket. Each month, Dr Abhishek will be giving readers step-by-step instructions on how to combine a series of postures to form a simple routine.

he Sun Salutation is an effective way of loosening up, stretching, massaging and toning all the joints, muscles, and internal organs of the body and is ideally practised before other *Asanas* (postures). Its versatility and application make it one of the most useful methods of inducing a healthy, vigorous and active life.

Sun Salutation is composed of three elements: form, energy and rhythm. The twelve *Asanas* are the physical matrix around which the form of the practice is woven. These *Asanas* generate *prana*, the subtle energy which activates the psychic body. Their performance, in a steady, rhythmic sequence, reflects the rhythms of the universe; the twenty-four hours of the day, the twelve zodiac phases of the year

and the rhythm of the body/mind complex generates the transforming force which produces a fuller and more dynamic life. The ideal time to practise the Sun Salutation is at sunrise, the most peaceful time of the day. Whenever possible, practise in the open

air, facing the rising sun. Sunset

is also a good time to practise as

it stimulates the digestive fire.

However, the Sun Salutation can be practised any time of the day provided the stomach is empty. Beginners should start with two or three rounds and add one more round every week to avoid fatigue.

Advanced practitioners may practise a larger number of rounds; however strain should be avoided at all times. For physical benefits, practise three to 12 rounds more quickly and for spiritual benefits, three to 12 rounds slowly.

#### **Contraindications:**

The practice of the Sun Salutation should be immediately discontinued if a fever, acute inflammation, boils or rashes occur. These may develop due to excess toxins in the body.

People suffering from high blood pressure, coronary artery disease, those who have had a stroke should not practice the Sun Salutation, as it may over stimulate or damage a weak heart or blood vessel system.

People with back conditions should consult a medical expert before commencing this practice. Although some back problems may be alleviated, conditions such as slipped discs and sciatica will be better managed through an al-

ternative Asana program.

Completely avoid the practice if suffering with a hernia or intestinal tuberculosis.

#### **Benefits:**

The Sun Salutation stimulates and balances all the systems of the body, including the endocrine, circulatory, respiratory and digestive systems. Its great influence on the pineal gland and hypothalamus helps to prevent pineal degeneration and calcification. This balances the transition time between childhood and adolescence in growing children.

Synchronizing breathing with the physical movements of the Sun Salutation ensures that the practitioner, at least for few minutes daily, breathes as deeply and rhythmically as possible.

This removes the carbon dioxide from the lungs and replaces it with fresh oxygen, increasing mental clarity by bringing fresh, oxygenated blood to the brain.

#### Position 1: Pranamasana (Prayer Pose)

Stand upright with your feet together and eyes closed. Slowly bend the elbows and place the palms together in front of the chest in *namaskara mudra* (as shown in first picture), mentally offering homage to the sun, the source of all energy. Breathe normally and relax the whole body.

#### Position 2: Hastha Utthanasana (Raised Arm Pose)

While inhaling, raise and stretch both arms above the head with arms separated, shoulder width apart. Bend the head, arms and trunk backward.

Benefits: Tones spinal nerves, opens lungs and removes excess weight.

#### Position 3: Padahastasana (Hand to foot pose)

While exhaling, bend forward until the fingers or the palms of the hand touch the floor on either side of the feet, keeping your legs straight or bent at the knees. Try to touch your knees with the forehead without any strain to your back and neck. Do not be alarmed; it's very common to feel the deep stretch at the back of your legs (Stretching hamstring muscles).

Benefits: Improves digestion and helps to remove constipation.

#### Position 4: Ashwa Sanchalanasana (Equestrian pose)

Inhaling, stretch the right leg back as far as possible, keeping the foot flat and toes pointed. At the same time, bend the left knee, keeping the left foot on the floor in the same position, with the arms straight.

In the final position, the weight of the body should be supported with both hands, the left foot, right knee and right foot. The head should be tilted backward, the back arched and the inner gaze directed upward.

<u>Benefits</u>: Improves the function of abdominal organs by massaging them and strengthens the leg muscles.

#### **Position 5: Plank Pose**

Exhaling, move the left leg back to meet the right and position the whole body in a straight line like a plank of wood. Keep the heels vertical to the floor, contract the muscles of the thigh and pull up the knees, wrists resting under the shoulder.

Benefits: Strengthens the shoulders and the muscles of the arms.

#### **Position 6:** Balasana (Child Pose)

Drop both knees onto the floor, keep the feet flat and toes pointed. While exhaling move the body back, resting the buttocks on the heels. Do not place your hands in order to move your body back. Benefits: Stretches the shoulders and back muscles.

### Position 7: Ashtanga Namskara (salute with eight parts or

Keeping the trunk parallel to the floor, actively exhale and lower the chest between your palms on the floor. In the final position the knees, chest and chin should touch the floor simultaneously. The buttocks, hips and abdomen should be raised.

Benefits: Strengthens the legs and arm muscles, develops the chest.

#### Position 8: Urdhva Mukha Svanasana (Upward facing Dog)

With a deep inhalation, lift the chest, abdomen and thighs up, stretch the arms completely and push the head and trunk as far back as possible, with or without resting the knees on the floor. The spine, thighs and calves should be fully stretched, and the buttocks contracted tightly.

<u>Benefits</u>: Rejuvenates the spine, helps in removing lumbago, sciatica, and improves the elasticity of the lungs.



#### Position 9: Adho Mukha Svanasana (Downward facing dog)

Exhale completely, lift the hips very high and press the heels on the floor. Straighten the arms, move the head inward towards the feet without strain, keeping the elbows straight and extending the back. Keep the legs stiff and do not bend the knees but press the heels down. In case your hamstrings are tight and it's not possible to press heels on the floor, bend the knees slightly. Benefits: Strengthens the ankles, makes the legs shapely.

#### Position 10: Ashwa Sanchalasana (Equestrian pose)

This is same as position four. Inhaling, bend the right leg and bring the right foot forward between the hands. Simultaneously, lower the left knee so that it touches the floor and push the pelvis forward. Tilt the head backward, arch the back and gaze at the point where the eyebrows meet.

#### Position 11: Padahasthasana (Hand to foot pose)

This position is same as position three. Exhale and bring the left foot forward next to the right foot. With legs straight or slightly bent at the knees bring the forehead close to the knees, without straining.

#### Position 12: Hastha Utthanasana (raised arm pose)

This stage is a repetition of position two. Inhale, raising the torso and stretching the arms above the head. Keep the arms separated, shoulder width apart, bend the head, arm and trunk backward.

#### Position 13: Pranamasana (prayer pose)

This is the final position and the same as position one. Exhale, lower the hands, bring the palms together in front of the chest.
































n a recent edition of the BBC's *Top Gear* program, Clarkson, May and Hammond were let loose in a variety of Alfas. And while the boys inevitably caused havoc with 'their' cars, they did confess to having a soft spot for the marque. "A real driver's car," says Clarkson.

It is true: although sometimes temperamental and at times unreliable, an Alfa Romeo is immense fun to own and drive. These days they have been



somewhat sanitized but there are still good ones to choose from. One such is the Alfa Romeo GT.

The GT offers a choice of

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engines, from a 1.8 liter, producing a modest 140 bhp and 163 Nm of torque, to a 2.0 liter with 165 bhp – this motor is available with the optional Selespeed transmission – or a 1.9 liter common-rail diesel with just 150 bhp, but a massive amount of torque at 305 Nm, delivered at the low engine speed of 2,000 rpm.

All models are equipped with ABS and EBD, as well as a form of electronic stability control (ESC). The original ESC was developed in Germany by the Robert Bosch company; Alfa Romeo's version is produced by Magneti Marelli, which like Alfa, is part of the Fiat Group.

Fiat has recently agreed to take a 35 percent stake in ailing Chrysler in the United States and it is predicted that one or more Chrysler plants in the US will be

turned over to the manufacture of Fiat and Alfa Romeo vehicles in the future, particularly as Fiat specializes in small cars which, in the current economic paralysis, US consumers may well turn to in the coming years.

The optional Selespeed gearbox is a cross between an automatic and a manual, in that you can change gear without use of the clutch. It has its critics as being neither one thing nor the other, but in practice it is easy and extremely rapid to use.

A conventional gearshift involves three stages. First, the clutch is disengaged to disconnect power from the wheels; secondly, the driver selects and engages the gear and then the clutch is engaged to resume sending power to the wheels and engine speed begins to increase again.

The Selespeed gearbox carries out these maneuvers fully automatically. When the driver changes gear, it is no longer necessary to release the accelerator pedal and depress the clutch; the Magneti Marelli electronic unit controls the gearbox and requests the clutch opening, reduces the torque regardless of the accelerator position and selects the next



ear.

The Selespeed is essentially a robotized manual gearbox. The decision of which gear to be engaged is left to the driver, but three actuators intervene to carry out the actions that are normally performed during conventional gear shifts. One controls the clutch, the other controls the engagement and the third controls the speed selection. A fourth actuator is linked to the engine's fly-by-wire throttle.

This system manages power delivery on the basis of requests received through the gearbox control system. During gearshifts, Selespeed is in charge of the engine to ensure maximum performance and removes any risk of damage to any part of the drivetrain as the Selespeed system runs through its programs.

Developed from Magneti Marelli's experience in Formula One, particularly with Ferrari also part of the Fiat combine - the major advantages of the Selespeed system are its speed of gear shift and the reduction of power losses normally associated with automatic gearboxes. Alfa Romeo is distributed in Thailand by Thai Prestige Auto Sales in Bangkok. There are a number of Alfa models available in the Kingdom and as the Top Gear boys said, they are still all 'driver's cars'. Well worth a look.

### MONEY TALKS

ast week's article covered London-based AMT Futures and the component funds that make up its CFL Fund. Over the last decade this fund has returned, on average, 16.8% per annum in US dollars, and even in the difficult environment of 2008, still returned 11%. This year also promises to be very difficult, or to coin a term seemingly in vogue with CEOs everywhere, "challenging".

Moving from the CFL Fund, which AMT Futures describes as "conservative", to the other end of the spectrum, one meets the aggressive IQS Fund. In well over a decade this fund has just about seen it all, so to speak. Its most trying time was "9/11", which quite literally destroyed the New York Futures Exchange. The

Exchange thereafter relocated to New Jersey and initially was able to trade for only two hours a day. The management of AMT was faced with a dilemma: IQS does not in fact have any human beings at the helm. It is a "black box" strategy (an industry term) more commonly called computerbased, and as such, it behaves in the manner of its program. It was decided that it would be left in its original state, as tampering with what had been established could also contaminate the system. Obviously, the fund and its trading system were completely unaware of 9/11.

One of the great advantages of computer-based trading systems is that they don't have egos. Traders have egos and this so often interferes with profitability. Computer trading is referred to as "emotionless trading". IQS in its original form only traded 14 different commodities, including oil, gold and so on, and in reality very often only held positions in less than half of this amount. The great advantage of futures in-

cludes the ability to be both "long" and "short".

It is worthwhile to mention that the majority of investors are only experienced in "long" investments; in other words, appreciat-

ing in value. For example, a typical mutual fund/unit trust/UCITS investor expects to profit when the price of something appreciates, for example when the S&P 500 index moves from 800 to 900.

Invest-

ment, when the investor or fund seeks to make a profit from a falling price, almost seems, to many, as being somehow immoral. Even regulators were sucked into this opinion in various stockmarkets during falling markets in 2008. The regulators eventually saw the error of their ways and rescinded bans on various short selling techniques in equity (stockmarkets). Even in stockmarkets, short sellers are useful contributors, since they add depth to the market, which is another way of saying they add liquidity. Markets that are liquid are much easier to trade in than illiquid markets.

However, going back to futures markets, selling short is not just an *option* for the whole market, it is an *essential*. There must

be a counterparty in every transaction. Without wishing to deviate too much from the core story, it is a major problem when there is no counterparty. This is exactly one of the problems that is facing the fi-

nancial system. Banks and other parties are holding huge "blocks" of what are commonly termed "toxic assets". These blocks, with labels such as structured investment vehicles, SIVs and the rest of the alphabet soup,

never had a counterparty. They were created mainly by banks and based on in-house or other mathematical models instead of being "marked to market".

Futures markets are not a sophisticated "game". Major players in agriculture, mining, financials, currencies and energy need to use futures to reduce risk and enhance clarity in their businesses. One very common use of futures is by airlines; an airline that is not using futures is described as being "unhedged": in other words, they are at the total mercy if aviation fuel jumps in price. Since its inception in 1996 the IQS Fund has recorded an average compound annual growth rate of over 33%. There-

was actually below average. However, anyone who made 15.11% in US dollars in 2008 would have beaten almost all other investors. For those with pounds sterling base to their portfolio, and there are many on this island, AMT was a godsend, returning almost 40%.

During 2008, IQS changed in nature from a single fund to two funds. It was felt that the original IQS had simply become too big to be as agile as it needed to be to look to the future. The decision was taken to add another fund, IQS-A, as it was renamed, on a 50% share with IQS. The name still remains IQS. IQS-A, the "new kid on the block", is, in fact, the Altis Fund, which has long been a component of the CFL Fund. It has been described as Altus with added vigor and turbo-charging.

The SAV Fund, which AMT Futures labels as "moderate" and which is my personal favorite, is a 75% mix of CFL and 25% IQS. Formed in 1998, the SAV Fund returned 13.83% in 2008 and has returned 23.40% annual compound growth. SAV might be my preferred fund but my clients usually move to IQS: it just seems irresistible. All funds have the same custodian, administrator and accountants as detailed last week. Listed in the Cayman Islands for tax purposes, the fund is directed from London and AMT is fully regulated with actual trading taking place on the major futures markets of the world. Through the fund range, a huge number of different commodities are traded, be it lumber to bonds, energy to metals, soya to currencies: the list is almost endless. This is real diversification.

# Off the SHELF

ill Bryson is a supremely versatile writer with a laid-back conversational style and a easy sense of humor. He has written travel books about America, Britain and Australia, a funny memoir about his childhood, a scholarly work on American and British English, and a catch-all masterpiece called "A Short History of Nearly Everything". His thirteenth book is a biography: "Shakespeare" (Atlas Books, London, 2008, 200pp).

This is a slender volume because Bryson doesn't really have much to say. Not much is known about Shakespeare's life, so Bryson contents himself with describing what his schooling would have been like and how London looked when he first arrived.

### Much Ado About Nothing

"Boys normally attended school for seven or eight years, beginning at the age of seven. The school day was long and characterized by an extreme devotion to tedium. Pupils sat on hard wooden benches from six in the morning to five or six in the evening, with only two short pauses for refreshment, six days a week. Discipline was probably strict. A standard part of a teacher's training was how to give a flogging. Shakespeare had a great deal of Latin, for the life of every grammar school boy was spent almost entirely in reading, writing and reciting Latin in the most mind-numbingly repetitious manner."

Bryson trots out all the mysteries of Shakespeare's life – what was his relationship with the effeminate Earl of Southampton to whom he dedicated his two early long poems; who was the "W.H." to whom he wrote the sonnets, and who was the Dark Lady – and fails to solve them. What he does manage is to summon up his en-


thusiasm for the sheer delight of Shakespeare's language.

Hundreds of every day phrases were coined by Shakespeare and his neologisms were legion. "Anyway, and obviously, it wasn't so much a matter of how many words he used, but what he did with them - and no one has ever done more," Bryson writes. "It is often said that what sets Shakespeare apart is his ability to illuminate the workings of the soul and so on, and he does that superbly, goodness knows, but what really characterizes his work - every bit of it, in poems and plays and even dedications, throughout every portion of his career - is a positive and palpable appreciation of the transfixing power of language. A Midsummer Night's Dream remains an enchanting work after four hundred years, but few would argue that it cuts to the very heart of human behaviour. What it does do is take and give, a positive satisfaction in the joyous possibilities of verbal expression."

Bryson is also very good at summoning up the atmosphere of the early theaters of London. The Globe was built in 1599 and lasted a mere fourteen years till it burned down in 1613. This was the period when Shakespeare wrote Julius Caesar, Hamlet, Twelfth Night, Measure for Measure, Othello, King Lear, Macbeth, Anthony and Cleopatra.

"We thrill at these plays now," Bryson writes. "But what must it have been like when they were brand new, when all their references were timely and sharply apt, and all the words never before heard? Imagine what it must have been like to watch Macbeth without knowing the outcome, to be part of a hushed audience hearing Hamlet's soliloquy for the first time, to witness Shakespeare speaking his own lines. There cannot have been, anywhere in history, many more favored places than this."

It is this enthusiasm for the subject that carries the reader



along, though there's isn't much meat to this book. Compared with his huge all-encompassing "A Short History of Nearly Everything", which delved into the beginning of the universe and the rise of man, this is pretty weak beer. It's as if he wrote this book on contract and not any grand passion. Still, his occasional moments of passion make the book worth reading.

with it, while one that is "complimentary" with the meal comes at no extra charge.

The two words are easily confused, because they used to be one word, spelled "complementary." But in the late 17<sup>th</sup> century people began to use the spelling "compliment" for acts of courtesy. To "make a compliment" of something meant, and means, to give it. To "pay a compliment," of course, means to praise. Once

you start thinking of it that way – that the dessert is a courtesy on the part of the restaurant, much as kind words are courteous – it begins to make sense that "complimentary" can mean "free."

Q: A co-worker and I have been in a week-long dispute over the past tense of the word "sneak." I was brought up that "snuck" is not a word and that the correct word is "sneaked." Is 'snuck' a perfectly acceptable word, unbeknownst to me? Or is "sneaked" perhaps a perfectly acceptable word, unbeknownst to him?"

Barbara replies: "Sneaked" is perfectly acceptable and has been throughout our lifetimes, and it continues to be the more common word. But according to six major contemporary American dictionaries, "snuck" is becoming or has become acceptable too, especially in informal English.

**Q:** Years ago I watched television talk show host Dick Cavett interview a celebrity who used the word "forte" to mean another person's strong point. He pronounced it "for-tay". Mr. Cavett

corrected him, saying he should have pronounced the noun "fort," one syllable. "Forte" pronounced "for-tay" is an adjective that means "loud" in classical music.

Barbara replies: Years ago Dick Cavett was right. But the standard pronunciation of "forte" meaning "a strength" has been changing during the past halfcentury. These days, most people, including about threequarters of the American Heritage Dictionary (AHD) usage panel, pronounce it "for-tay." As the AHD notes, "Speakers who are aware of the origin of the word (it comes from French, whereas the musical direction comes from Italian) may wish to continue to pronounce it as one syllable but at an increasing risk of puzzling their listeners."

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### Abhisit's new measures give too much power to AoT security guards

A few months after the closure of Bangkok's two main airports by People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) protesters, the new government of Abhisit Vejjajiva is working to enact legislation that would give Airports of Thailand (AoT) security officials the power to block, disperse, fine and even detain for up to 24 hours persons causing damage at AoT airports – before handing them over to police.

While adopting new measures to minimize the chance of another airport takeover is certainly a good idea, giving security guards employed by a public company de facto police powers hardly seems an effective or logical way to go about it.

The matter also raises human rights and constitutional issues that deserve careful scrutiny by the Council of State and a very serious debate in Parliament. Even PM Abhisit himself has conceded that the draft version passed by his Cabinet should be amended before passage.

If passed in its current form, the draft would set a new precedent and could even lead to a request by other private security firms for similar upgraded powers "in the name of national security".

This is particularly troubling when considering the number of violent crimes carried out in Thailand over the years by private security guards, a good number of whom are former police or military men who have been kicked off the force for disciplinary reasons. There is also a large number of ex-convicts among their ranks, thanks to lax vetting by some security firms.

The takeover of Bangkok's two airports from November 25 to December 2 has cost the Thai economy up to 290 billion baht in lost income, according to a Bank of Thailand estimate.

However, a review of these events and the earlier takeover of Phuket Airport reveals that the police had more than enough time to react and intervene, using measured force if necessary.

In fact, the police should have been on high alert, given the fact that the PAD leaders had publicly threatened the action days before.

As admitted by the government, the proposed legislation is in large part a public relations exercise aimed at convincing foreign tourists that there will never be another airport closure in Thailand. But news of the passage will likely get little, if any, coverage in the international media and that aim will go unmet.

More likely, it will backfire when some rogue security guards, drunk on their newfound powers, begin to use them to harass, extort or otherwise intimidate innocent air travelers.

### A question of infrastructure



### Letter

As the development of Phuket's hotels and Governor's resorts continues, the long-term goal is to cement the island's reputation as one of the world's top 10 holiday destinations. In the latest

edition of The Governor's Letter, Phuket Governor Preecha Ruangian reveals some of the areas of Phuket that need upgrading, from both government and private investment, to guarantee that Phuket can deal with a large transient population, and highlights some measures that are being implemented to improve the level of service provided to the island's multinational visitors.

ooking ahead at Phuket's prospects as a tourist destination in the long term, we are expecting to be welcoming more than 12 million visitors per year to the island within the next five to 10 years. Now is the time to consider how we will cope with the extra demand put on the island's infrastructure.

Phuket is already recognized as one of the world's top 10 holiday destinations and development of Phuket International Airport is central to ensuring convenience for our visitors. However, once people arrive at the airport, they need to be able to get to their final destination conveniently.

We need to offer more options than just the current taxi gangs; we need to develop public transport that will take tourists from the airport directly to regional destinations, such as Phang Nga, Krabi, Trang and Koh Phi Phi.

With regards to getting around Phuket, this also raises the question of how the island's roads will cope with the increase in traffic. Even though Thepkasattri Road is four lanes wide, traffic still builds up on it. There are no flyovers or underpasses, leaving only dangerous U-turns.

Is it time to build a motorway that will take people from the airport directly to main destinations around the island? If such a motorway is built, vehicles could travel directly to Patong, Cherng Talay, Karon and Phuket

I have asked civic groups to look into and debate the possibility of whether a motorway should be built, and to discuss solutions for some of the other infrastructure development challenges fac-

Those involved in public water supply have been asked to consider solutions for the demand that will be put upon the province's water reserves and treatment of waste water, while others have been asked to come up with ways of ensuring that the island has some kind of back-up electricity supply so that we can avoid island-wide blackouts like the one that occurred in late December 2008, when there were problems with the power supply from Surat Thani.

We must make solid plans to deal with these kinds of issues if we are to continue developing Phuket as a world class destination. The developers and entrepreneurs, who benefit from the boost in business provided by the increasing number of visitors, need to take on some of that responsibility and implement their own self-sufficient power- and water-supply systems, rather than relying solely on public infrastructure, because public facilities simply aren't adequate to deal with the demand.

Investment to improve the island's infrastructure will have to come from joint ventures between government and private sectors. There are plenty of private investors ready to contribute to developing the island's infrastructure that are looking at the long-term – 30 to 40 years – before they will see returns on their investments.

Many of these private investors come to me seeking approval for projects, such as the proposed tunnel between Kata and Patong, but as the governor, I do not have the authority to approve such projects; that is up to the central government. However, I can advise different options and then oversee cost control if and when projects are given approval. In my opinion, private investment is key to effective development.

Compared to other provinces, Phuket is unique, so development of the island has to be looked at from a different perspective. Provincial authorities in the Northeast, for example, must handle issues related to agriculture, whereas here in Phuket, the focus is on convenience for our foreign visitors and the strain on resources by the large transient population.

Alternative rapid-transport options have emerged recently. A new helicopter service – see this week's 'Inside Story' on pages 4 and 5 – started up in Nai Yang recently. The helicopters are

modern and surprisingly quiet; they make about as much noise as a large truck and can carry family groups. Helicopters are an advantage in emergency situations when people need to be transported from surrounding islands.

On the other side of the island in Pa Khlok, the new Air Park, where small private aircraft can take off and land, is another positive development in offering more travel options to the island's

Although these two services are obviously aimed exclusively at wealthy clientèle, it is this kind of private investment in alternative transport options that will allow us to cater to the growing

As for improving visitors' experiences on the ground, we're working on improving public facilities and services around the main tourist beaches by establishing organized associations for taxi drivers, speedboat and jet ski operators in each area to join, rather than them operating as individual gangs. The aim of doing this is to ensure better safety standards and fair treatment for customers.

On January 30, I received confirmation that we have the goahead to establish a branch of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs at Provincial Hall (See this week's front page story). Representatives from the ministry in Bangkok will be coming to train local staff

and the center should be open within three months. The center will provide a range of advice and services for foreigners, so that they won't have to go to Bangkok anymore to process documents, such as marriage certificates, as operations will be performed on

The center will also be a venue for holding training seminars for businesses involved in the tourist industry. It will be a place where we can learn more about the cultures of different nationalities in order to help us better serve the variety of foreign visitors that make up the tourist sector.

Following requests from producers of brand name products to clamp down on copyright infringement, I have ordered the police to carry out more frequent raids on vendors and producers of fake goods.Raids are conducted almost daily in Patong, Kata and Karon.

Vendors of fake goods are abundant in those areas, but they are just the tip of the iceberg. We really need to be apprehending the producers of the fake goods. However, it is not easy to find the factories where the counterfeit goods are produced, as they are usually located elsewhere. Some of the goods are brought down from Bangkok, while some are offloaded from boats. However, we will continue to supress copyright infringements as they come to our attention.



n my visit to the United States last fall, I was appalled at the deterioration of the airline service and the chaos that engulfs some airports – we're talking Third World stuff here folks, and the US is supposed to be a First World country.

Cramped in my window seat, starving and forlorn, I figured things couldn't get any worse; then I arrived at Chicago's O'Hare International Airport.

O'Hare has gained infamy as possibly the most chaotic airport in the world. Delayed flights, planes piled up on the tarmac and fleets of desperate aircraft circling overhead waiting for a place to land. The tales of frazzled passengers waiting days on end for connecting flights have become legendary. They should rename it O'Hell.

My ordeal was a fun-fest by comparison. My incoming flight had been delayed leaving me just 15 minutes to make my connecting flight. That was a concourse away so off I galloped through the walkways till I came to the relevant gate.

"Need to get on the flight to Boston," I gasped, thrusting my boarding pass at the gate atten-

My flight was scheduled to leave in two hours – which soon stretched to four, plus they changed the departure gate five times. These changes were posted on the "Departures" board. If you didn't keep a close eye on it, you'd end up sitting at the wrong gate and your flight would leave without you.

By the time I got on the plane, those mini-pretzels tasted pretty good. Mind you, even the grandmotherly flight attendants looked good....

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allelujah! It has come to pass. Yes, the iPhone 3G – the one that was launched in the US back in mid-2008 – is finally here courtesy of True Move, the only service provider currently licensed to sell it in Thailand.

So, what is the fuss regarding the iPhone 3G all about? Its measurements read 155.5mm long by 62.1mm wide and it weighs in at a hefty 133 grams.

The 3G's touch screen measures 3.5 inches diagonally and uses a 480x320 pixel resolution. For those of you who are not *au fait* with the latest and greatest in user interface technology, we can tell you that the 3G has just a couple of what you might call buttons. The phone uses a touch screen interface that Apple calls the most innovative leap in user interface technology since the mouse.

The 3G acts like a regular mobile phone. It allows you to make and receive calls, use SMS, store contacts and keep schedules, in addition to all the great things cell phones are used for. But the real appeal of the iPhone lies in its other capabilities. Internet access, Bluetooth, GPS, music player, camera, video recorder, e-mail, and over 100,000 third-party applications. The phone, as the name suggests, uses a 3G connection, which is supposed to be faster and more streamlined than its predecessor. It boasts a quick memory, easy-

to-use interface, and a sleek design much beloved by iPod touch and current iPhone users. The iPhone 3G comes in 8GB and 16GB versions.

The 8GB version alone can hold up to 1,750 songs, 10,000 photos, and 10 hours of video footage, ensuring hours of entertainment for the user.

The recent release of the iPhone 3G in Bangkok received somewhat mixed reviews. AIS, the leading network provider in Thailand, declined to sign a deal with Apple, stating that the inventory costs would be too high in relation to profit margins. Also, data exchange, SMS, and mobile Internet use covers only 10% of mobile phone use in Thailand. The majority of mobile users in

the country primarily use their phones for voice calls.

Critics say that the market and technological environment in Thailand is simply not ready for it. The reception for voice calling on the iPhone 3G is also known to be less than great in this area of South East Asia. Other more seasoned hand-held developers like Nokia and Samsung are busy developing their own state-of-theart touch screen mobiles, keeping Apple on its toes.

The competition in the short term will force Apple to significantly lower its prices, another reason why the bigger service providers remain hesitant to jump on the iPhone bandwagon.

mobile phone use in Thailand. True Move is the only com-The majority of mobile users in pany in Thailand that has so far

inked a deal with Apple to sell the 3G. The company held a launch party in Bangkok at Siam Paragon on January 17. Customers waited patiently in line for hours to purchase the iPhone. Unfortunately, True Move, underestimating demand for the iconic accessory, were forced to turn away customers when they ran out of stock. Others were turned away simply because they did not have the proper documents for extended payments.

Purchasers of the iPhone wishing to pay via monthly installments were required to produce documents confirming them as previous True Move customers, or equivalent documents from their bank. Some of them waited in line as long as eight hours, only

to be turned away. So, what's the bottom line with the 3G? Despite misgivings and obvious distribution issues, it's still a fine piece of technology.

Long-time Apple customers who enjoyed the iPod touch and the previous versions of the iPhone will not be overawed by a wide array of new features, but will definitely experience a faster connection, more convenient interface and a generally streamlined product. In all honesty, unless you are a die hard Apple fan, waiting a while before purchasing the 3G is advisable, at least until it receives coverage on a wider array of networks. It should not be long before the 3G becomes more suited to Thailand.

Until then, I'll stick to surfing the web on my laptop, and navigating by the stars. The iPhone 3G is currently available from True Move for 23,275 baht, with a basic monthly plan costing 599 baht per month for 12 months for the 8GB version. The 16GB version costs 27,075 baht, with the same monthly plan.

The service plans come in Basic, Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Platinum. The Basic package is available only to current True Customers. The Bronze package costs 1,199 baht per month for 24 months, silver is available at 1,399 baht per month, gold is 1,699 baht per month and platinum is 1,999 baht, all on 24 month contracts.

Sharda (Luke Mills) and The Sting (Dave Wales).



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### Gardening in Eden

How could such sweet and wholesome hours
Be reckon'd but with herbs and flowers.

ince moving into my house in Phuket, a rapid twelve months has passed. Time enough to watch the growth spurts of a gar-

den that has burgeoned and greened during the monsoon and now catches its collective breath at least most of the plants do - for a diminished existence during the dog-days from December to April. Little rain and a thermometer reading that can reach the upper thirties. A swimming pool at midday almost the temperature of blood. But I take com-

fort from the fact that at least the situation bears no resemblance to that of southern Spain, where years ago I had carved out a ter-


raced garden from a hillside.

In mountainous Andalucia, when the December rain came it fell in wintry torrents, cold and unremitting – the soil saturated for days on end; here in Phuket, the rain may fall with a tropical intensity but it is a warm rain and quickly absorbed by the receptive earth. My Spanish plants might endure six months without a drop of moisture. Here, even in the dry

season, there will be always be some precipitation to alleviate the drought.

I should say at this juncture that I am no expert on tropical horticulture, merely an enthusiastic amateur whose love of nature was first fostered by a country childhood in South Worcestershire and a father in


love with opera and roses. So when I began planting my garden in this wondrous tropical paradise, I inevitably made mis-



I have still not found the right situation for one or two shrubs. Take, for instance, my solitary Angel's Trumpet (*Brugmansia*). Several of these exotic – and toxic – plants had flourished in Spain; I had also seen superb pink-belled specimens the size of small trees on the terraces of Doi Inthanon in Chiang Mai. But here in Phuket the *Brugmansia* took neither to the shade of my walled back garden or, moved in desperation, to the full sun of a border. I am still without an answer.

Of two original trees on the land, one, a magnificent sixty-foot tree and home to several species of birds, was too close to the foundations and reluctantly consigned to the tender mercies of the bulldozer; the other, a *pseudoacacia*, was far enough away from the business end of things to be reprieved.

This tree now daily drops its small round leaves into the swimming pool, but at the time, it provided and still bestows a small oasis of shade for newly established plants. But more shade was needed. So one of my first tasks was to identify small trees and substantial shrubs that would grow quickly enough to provide the dappled light, the *chiaroscuro* shading so essential to a garden in southern Thailand. Of this more anon...



If the climate is one of the key considerations in establishing a garden anywhere, the other is – self-evidently – the soil. This is particularly true of Phuket. There seems to be only a thin covering of top soil on most of the island. When you dig down, you rapidly encounter a reddish sub-soil that looks most inviting, but which is pretty much devoid of organic nutrients for all but the hardiest of plants. Earthworms just do not go there, with the result that there is little humus, and the leaf litter that, rotted down, could become organic nourishment for plant roots, tends to stay on the surface.

This situation was com-

pounded by a problem familiar to all new homeowners with gardening aspirations. And after all, my house was brand new, a threestorey affair built on 700 square meters of land.

Big enough, you may say. But however large the plot, building techniques inevitably scour away most of the existent top-soil and leave behind a residue not only of concrete, brick and breeze-block fragments but worse, soil saturated with all the cement run-off from the construction process. Lime-hating plants beware! The answer had to be lots of compost. And there is plenty of that around the place: it is the stuff piled up in sacks at every garden center in Phuket.

One of the consequences of these conditions – the fierce midday sun and an impoverished subsoil that resembles kiln-fired clay when baked dry – was that conventional grass was unlikely to thrive. And a lawn was a musthave.

Of course, conventional grass – rye or fescue or Bermuda – looks superb when assiduously

watered and tended (witness the Honda showrooms on Chao Fa East Road), but for low maintenance – and I knew I would be away from Phuket sometimes – I settled for the coarse-leaved variety known as St Augustine grass. This variety grows steadily and will put up with being trampled on, so long as it gets watered during the dry season. If you don't water it for two or three days, it starts to look stressed and then turns brown. It has good powers of recovery, but I have to confess that the hundred bags of compost that provided a mulch before the turf was laid proved in the end, a tad inadequate.

One of the first rules of life and gardening – don't skimp unless you absolutely have to...

I realize that all this sounds a bit doom-laden. Not a bit of it. Understand the requirements of your flowers and shrubs, and gardening in paradise can be a delight.


I am still learning, but that, after all, is part of the challenge – and part of the fun.

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
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# Next Stop Camelot?

While this was the era of civil rights, the birth of a new generation of young political activists and flower power, it was also the start of a long march forward, through media and business, of a more consolidated and interconnected world. Financial markets were starting to realize that entire new markets existed beyond the intersection of Main Street and Wall Street.

Meanwhile, back in 2009,

democracy remains a fragile concept in every far-flung corner of the planet. While communism, for the most part, has gone the way of the vinyl record; terrorism and cultural conflict, coupled with religious extremism, have taken their place at the top of the list of potential doomsday scenarios.

> Which takes us back to Obama. It is easy to picture him waking up in the White House in an unfamiliar bed, on the first day of a new job desperate to make an impression, and deciding if he really wants to get up and save the

world. That die has already been cast and, while the collective gaze of foreign eyes are focused impatiently on the leader of the free world, here in Thailand, things seem to be moving at a decidedly more pedestrian pace.

While the stabilization of the Abhisit government has been well received and strife in the Big Mango has subsided, Thailand, which has stuck its head in the sand regarding domestic politics for nearly two years, is hardly making progress on economic reforms. In today's climate you are either going forward or backward; there is no middle ground. While the positive effects of a

new government have pushed us forward a little, a much bigger swell has gathered and has thrown us back into a much larger maelstrom; something akin to the wave that struck the fishing boat in "The Perfect Storm."

Abhisit and Obama are indeed strange bedfellows, but are not in completely different situations. The fate of their nation's economies firmly rest upon their political willpower, vision and ability to get things done. In the past, Thailand was able to ride along comfortably in the wake of its more developed neighbors, Hong Kong and Singapore, and more recently, the nascent tigers of China and India.

In today's marketplace it's every man for himself, and it requires a big effort to reach the surface just to get a breath of fresh air. The past 12 months have been costly, and when you speak to international risk managers on the prospects of reviving the local economy, they consistently place this country in the lower echelons when making comparisons.

For real estate in Phuket, we rely, and will continue to do so, on foreign investment. What's missing from government reforms are changes in ownership laws so foreigners can own property on a freehold basis; an absence of debt for overseas buyers and an inability for most developers to obtain bank gearing.

Tourist visas have gone backwards. Those who enter Thailand across land borders are given only 15 days on arrival, instead of thirty, making it more difficult for those wishing to spend money in the Kingdom to do so. Currently, the reactions from the institutional overseas investment market and foreign chambers of commerce have highlighted that the current agenda offers nothing significant in attempting to bring foreign money back after its rapid migration in the past few years.

The reality is that the current property market is like a barren desert, and while there is some demand at the very top and bottom of the property markets, it's like ordering a cheeseburger and not getting the meat.

We all hope for the best for Abhisit and Obama and their respective challenges. Democracy, at the end of the day is, in principal, a good thing. At the same time, the servicing of needs in a market such as Phuket, where tourism and property are such significant drivers of growth and prosperity, will hopefully fall under a greater national spotlight in the coming months.

While it's nice to sleep in, it's high time to get up and out of bed.



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
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


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
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
