Mob blocks Kamala roads

By Khunakorn Terdkiatkhachorn KAMALA: Kamala villagers

blockaded the Kamala-Patong Road for 20 hours from the evening of March 17 in a protest over police handling of a brutal assault on a Kamala man.

The protest began at Kamala Police Station at around 7 pm, though traffic was not disrupted until around 9 pm, when a blockade was formed at Kamala

Protesters quickly set up tents and loudspeakers and used vehicles to seal off the intersec-

At its peak, up to 500 people joined in the protest.

Many people traveling along the road, including large numbers of tourists heading in and out of Patong for St Patrick's Day celebrations, were forced to abandon their vehicles and walk home.

Villagers were angry that Cherng Talay resident Lunglode Suepsin, 20, had been bailed after handing himself in earlier that day.

Mr Lunglode, the nephew of the Cherng Talay Tambon Chief Sommit Suepsin, had been charged with the assault of Somsak "Big" Maisaphrao, 27, the manager of a row of rental houses on Soi Huakhuan in Kamala.

Mr Somsak claimed that

Mr Lunglode and three other men turned up drunk at the block at around midnight on March 6 and demanded to see one of the residents.

When Mr Somsak told them the resident wasn't there, they started stealing mangoes from the trees around the houses, he said.

He claimed that after he told them to stop, they attacked him. He said they dragged him to the ground by his hair, then hacked him several times with a sharpened car leaf spring.

He sustained wounds to his

hand and arms, requiring 200 stitches at Patong Hospital.

Later on the morning of March 7 he went to Kamala Police Station and reported the crime. But Mr Somsak and his relatives also made their own inquiries about the attackers and identified four men they believed were involved, including Mr Lunglode.

When the police had made no arrests by March 9, Mr Somsak gave them the men's names.

Mr Lunglode handed himself in to Cherng Talay Police

Station at 3 pm on March 17. He was taken to Kamala Police Station, charged with assault and then bailed by his father.

After word spread that Mr Lunglode had been released, the protest began.

The protesters' demands included that all officers connected with the case be transferred from Kamala Police, that the perpetrators of the crime be arrested within one day, that a group of police officers the protesters claimed were breaking the law be transferred and that all protesters be immune from prosecution.


The blockade was formed at Kamala Intersections after police refused to accede to the protesters' demands.

Phuket Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima and other officials came to negotiate with the protest leaders, as well as Mr Somsak, at around 10.30 am on March 18.

By 1 pm, agreement had been reached to put the matter before Phuket Provincial Court, though details of the proceedings cannot be reported.

The protest dispersed at around 5.30 pm. At the time of writing, Mr Lunglode was back in police custody, along with two other suspects.

New genus of box jellyfish spotted off Phuket



CAPE PANWA: A new variation of the venomous box jellyfish [Chironex fleckeri] has been discovered in the waters around Phuket, the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC) reported on March 18.

Dr Somchai Bussarawit, Chief of Museum and Aquarium at the PMBC, said that the new species of jellyfish was discovered at Ao Nambor, the same part of Phuket where almost 40 were collected in July 2008 and a further 18 in October of the

The PMBC revealed that this new genus of box jellyfish is water, such as that associated really small and had shorter ten- with mangroves. tacles.

Dr Somchai said, "I need to research whether or not this is just a baby or a fully grown jellyfish. If this is indeed fully grown then it will pose a problem as it would be more difficult to see. Most box jellyfish are hard enough to see as it is – this is even smaller."

He was unable to confirm where else in Phuket these new

jellyfish might appear, but revealed that they like brackish

The PMBC is continuing to search for answers and Dr Somehai confirmed that experts from Australia will travel to Phuket to provide information and instruction about box jellyfish.

Dr Somchai reiterated that the best course of action following a suspected sting was the application of vinegar and that a doctor should be contacted immediately.

Billionaires lead Phuket's top 5 | Aleenta hosts turtle "rich and famous" villa list

PHUKET: Thailand's resort island of Phuket is fast becoming a hotspot for the world's rich and famous, who search for tropical island living coupled with great investment.

According to the recentlylaunched Phuket Insider blog, two of Forbes magazine's leading billionaires have über-luxury villas in Phuket.

The *Phuket Insider* – The source for all hotel and real estate news - was launched earlier this week by Bill Barnett, the well known property columnist, hospitality consultant and managing director of Phuket-based C9 Hotelworks.

"Our passion is to provide independent and intelligent news and commentary on the rapidly developing Phuket storyline.

You won't find banner ads, hotel bargains, condos for sale or Google AdWords on the site. It is purely relevant information as it happens without the mass commercialization," Barnett says.

Phuket's "Top 5" are listed as follows:

- 1. New Zealand's wealthiest brothers, Richard and Christopher Chandler (one brother formerly CEO of the Sovereign Group). Forbes reported that the Kiwi siblings have amassed a fortune valued at over US\$2 billion.
- 2. Canadian Robert Friedland of Ivanhoe Energy and Mines, with Forbes reporting a net worth of US\$1.4 billion.

3. Hong Kong's Allan Zeman, who is regarded as "The Father of Lan Kwai Fong". While his personal worth remains undisclosed, he is highly ranked amongst Asia's most wealthy and influential businessmen.

4. Finnish Formula One star Kimi Raikkonen. The flying Finn earns a reported US\$44 million per year from Ferrari and endorsements and is ranked by Forbes as the fifth highest-paid sports star and the 26th highestpaid celebrity.

5. British Binatone founder Gulu Lalvani is ranked fifth on Phuket's rich and famous list with his globe-trotting celebrity and multi-million dollar personal fortune.

release ceremony



KHOK KLOY, PHANG NGA: The Aleenta Resort and Spa on March 14 held a turtle release ceremony during which 20 young Olive Ridley turtles raised in captivity were released into the sea at Natai Beach.

The release was held at 10.30 pm, a time when the young turtles were least vulnerable to predators. The activity was organized by the resort's Sea Turtle Foundation, set up by the resort's Managing Director Anchalika Kijkanakorn. The foundation works with the Phang Nga Coastal Fisheries Research and Development Center to treat injured turtles until they can be released into the wild. The turtles are often injured by encounters with fishing equipment. The project is now in its third year.

The resort also held a fundraising event where gift vouchers, donated by numerous other resorts, were auctioned off. The event raised 250,000 baht for the foundation to continue its work. Part of the money raised was used in the process of fitting sea turtles with small global positional satellite (GPS) transmitters, allowing their movements and behaviors to be monitored and studied.

Random drug tests to continue for three months



Last Saturday night, officials tested nightlife workers on Bangla's infamous Soi Crocodile, but left foreign revelers free to go about their

PATONG: Drug testing taking place at popular nightlife entertainment venues in Patong have yet to result in any arrests of foreigners in connection with illegal

drug use.

Kathu Police are focusing mainly on Thai patrons and the bar staff in their mandatory urine testing, which gives on-the-spot results for three recreational drugs: ya bah (methamphetamine), ya ice (crystal methamphetamine) and ya E (Ecstasy).

Of the 204 people the police have tested up to and including Saturday night, eight turned up positive when their urine samples turned tell-tale purple.

Those testing positive are subsequently given more accurate blood tests to confirm the results and decrease the likelihood of a "false positive" result. First time offenders are required to register with the Phuket Public Health Office and undergo treatment for drug abuse.

Each night in Patong, three testing teams including police and public health officials conduct the surprise raids from 9 pm to 11 pm.

The initiative follows a policy directive issued by Deputy Prime Minister Suthep Thaugsuban to crack down on drug abuse.

The raids are scheduled to continue over a 90-day period that began on March 6.

Teen charged with attempted murder

CHERNG TALAY: Police on Thursday morning held a press conference to announce the arrest of a local youth wanted for shooting a rival gang member in late January.

Cherng Talay Police Inspector for Investigation Tongchai Matitum identified the suspect as 19-year-old Pharuhat Choochit, a resident of Cherng Talay Village 5. According to the press release, the shooting took place as a result of an ongoing dispute between two groups of young men. The first group, of which the suspect is a member, hails from Cherng Talay Village 5 and Village 2. The rival group, to which the victim Wissanu

Prateep Na Talang allegedly belonged, comes from Cherng Talay Village 6 and tambon Thepkrasattri Village 4.

The shooting took place at about 7 pm on January 26 during a high-speed motorcycle chase on the Cherng Talay-Ban Don Rd in Ban Pasak, Cherng Talay Village 4. According to a police press release, members of both gangs exchanged gunfire and the victim was hit in the stomach. His current condition was not reported in the press release.

Cherng Talay Police served Mr Pharuhat with the arrest warrant at his home on Tuesday, March 10. He was subsequently charged with attempted murder.





New governor names tourist revival as top priority

rch 16 marked the first day in office of Phuket's new governor, Wichai Phraisa-ngop.

Mr Wichai was greeted at the Governor's Mansion on Mon-

day morning by numerous officials and well-wishers, some traveling from as far away as Phang Nga and Surat Thani to attend the ceremony.

Transferred to Phuket from his previous posting as governor of Sing Buri

province in the Central Plains region, the native of Nakhon Pathom turned 59 last Thursday. Married to Mrs Thaisika, he has two grown-up children from a former marriage The holder of a bachelor's degree in political and administrative sciences from

PHUKET CITY: Monday Ma- Ramkhamhaeng University Faculty of Law, Gov Wichai is no stranger to the South. He served as Phang Nga governor for a year, starting in 2006.

He also has extensive ex-

perience in the Interior Ministry's Land Department, having been Land Office Director in Nakhon Pathom in 1997 and Deputy Director of the Land Department nationwide in 2003.

Gov Wichai admitted to being some-

what overwhelmed by the sudden nature of the transfer and said he expects the challenges facing him in Phuket to be very different from those he faced in Phang Nga. Improving the island's tourism-based economy is top of his agenda, but to achieve this will take a great deal of study and research from the outset, he ad-

Mr Wichai replaces former Governor Preecha Ruangian, who, despite serving less than five months in office, gained wide respect for his energetic efforts to learn about and improve Phuket. Both Dr Preecha and Mr Wichai were among 28 senior Interior Ministry officials who received transfer orders last week.

Many political observers think the reshuffle is intended to reduce the influence of former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra in the northern provinces, where he still has strong support. There was speculation in the Thai media that Dr Preecha's departure was prompted by the influence of local Democrat Party heavyweights. Such speculation

seems invalid, however, as the Interior Ministry portfolio is now in the hands of the newly formed Bhumjaithai Party, which is influenced by banned Buri Ram politician Newin Chidchob. Mr Newin is a longtime adversary of the Phuket Democrats, dating back to his role in the SorPorKor-401k land scandal that brought down the first Democrat-led government of Chuan Leekpai in 1995.

Siam Indigo damaged in fire

PHUKET CITY: The popular Siam Indigo Exotique Bar and Restaurant on Phang Nga Road was partially damaged in a fire that broke out at about 10:20 am on Sunday March 15.

Taweesak Suwit, an officer with the local Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM-Phuket) office, told the Gazette that two Phuket City fire trucks managed to bring the blaze under control.

The restaurant and bar occupies three shophouse units, built about 80 years ago, near the

K-bank Phuket main branch in what is now known as Old Phuket Town. Officials believe the fire started behind the bar counter and spread into the hall.

Phuket City Police Superintendent Wanchai Ekpornpit said that an electrical short circuit is thought to have been the cause of the fire, but that the police were waiting for forensic investigators to complete their report.

The actual damage was probably far less than the 1 million baht reported by some media outlets, he said.

PAD to hold huge rally in Phuket PHUKET: The People's Alliance

for Democracy (PAD) will stage a large rally at Saphan Hin in Phuket on April 18.

All five core PAD leaders - Sondhi Limthongkul, Chamlong Srimuang, Pipop Thongchai, Somsak Kosaisuk and Somkiat Pongpaiboon – are set to attend.

Mr Sondhi's Asian Satellite Television is organizing the rally, which will start at 4 pm and go on until midnight. Tickets will be priced at 200 baht.

Phuket is a major stronghold for the PAD, though local supporters have reportedly splintered into a 'hardcore' group and another, more moderate faction.

The Phuket rally will be nationally televised as a way of disseminating information about the current political situation in the country to PAD supporters.

According to PAD insiders, the movement is making prepa-

Family of accused boy speak out on molestation charges

17-year-old German boy arrested on March 9 on child mo lestation charges is a victim of abuse, not a perpetrator, his family claim.

That message was echoed by Dr Hanns H Schumacher, German Ambassador to Thailand, when he met Phuket Provincial Police Commander Apirak Hongtong on March 16 to discuss the case.

"My major message to the police... was that this guy, who is still a minor, cannot be considered as a perpetrator, but rather a victim. That's the message and I've got the impression that they were highly aware of that," Dr Schumacher said.

The boy is accused of conspiring with Dax J Young, a 41-year-old British national, to sexually abuse Thai boys as young as nine years old.

The boy's mother and sister are adamant that the boy should be released immediately and allowed to give evidence against Mr Young, who denies the charges against him.

They say the boy told them he had been sexually abused by the older man since shortly after

the family first met him in a Patong coffee shop in early 2005.

"This is unbelievable, what they are doing to an abused child. Why is he not sitting with the same children who got abused?" his sister asked.

Instead, the boy is locked up and awaiting trial in Phuket Juvenile Observation and Protection Center.

Police say he has confessed to the charges against him: namely, that he sexually abused boys as young as nine years old. At least two victims have been identified, though police suggest there are many more.

Evidence seized from Mr Young's house included images stored on digital cameras, CDs, a laptop and hard drives.

The images showed young boys naked and engaged in sexual acts. The images are also believed to show the German boy committing acts of sexual abuse against them.

But the question of what happened in the years leading up to the arrests is difficult to answer. The *Gazette* has discussed the case at length with the boy's mother and sister.

They said they fled to Thailand following the breakdown of the mother's relationship with the children's father in Cologne.

Describing the man as violent and disturbed, she said he was heavily dependent on drugs and alcohol and threatened to kill her and kidnap her children after the couple split up.

In December 2003, they arrived in Phuket, where they had been many times before and had friends.

But, they said, the children's father found out where they were and followed them to Phuket in July 2004. He wasted little time in restarting his campaign of harassment against the family during a two-month stay, they claimed.

Police told them that unless he committed a crime, there was nothing they could do, the family said

It seemed a relief, then, when the family met local photographer Dax J Young in the Coffee Lovers cafe near the Royal Paradise Hotel in Patong in early 2005.

Mr Young quickly earned their trust, showing the 14-yearold motorbike enthusiast pictures of CBRs and Harley Davidsons he had taken.

"He told us he could help us and it gave us comfort to just have someone to make us feel a little bit safe. When we had a problem we could call him and he would listen to us," the sister said. "When my father came, we'd call him and he'd come to meet us in the coffee shop or the cafe and sit with us."

With Mr Young's apparent protection, the family felt safer, despite the children's father remaining on the island.

Mr Young began to spend an increasing amount of time with the German youth. "In the afternoons they'd go to the beach or do something together. So I was quite happy and my mum was quite happy to find someone so he would not only be with women. To find someone who he could learn some different things from," his sister said.

Mr Young taught the boy about photography and computers, and the boy's English improved dramatically. "He saw him [Mr Young] as a friend and a father," his sister said. "I was very pleased about their association because Dax did not drink alcohol or take drugs," his mother said.

But in late 2006, the mother became seriously ill with an acute case of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), a progressive lung disease in which the lungs' airways narrow. She spent four weeks in intensive care in Phuket International Hospital (PIH).

"My brother, when he saw my mom with the respirator, he was just running around crazy. I saw him nearly melt down," his sister said.

"Dax told me, 'Don't worry, I'll take care of you, take care of the children.' Everything was OK, and I thought, 'Ah, it's good that we have Dax to take care and look after the children and see that they eat, that everything is being taken care of when I am in hospital,'" the mother said.

Suffering more acute exacerbations of her condition, the boy's mother spent time in Bangkok Hospital Phuket before returning to PIH at the end of 2007.

Until that time she had been covered by BUPA health insurance. But after her last stay at PIH, she discovered that her insurance would no longer cover her treatments.

The family struggled to pay the bill and the German Honorary Consul Dirk Neumann be-



came involved in the case. He advised the mother that the best thing for her and her family would be to return to Germany, where social welfare would see that she was cared for.

But she refused to do so and has remained on the island since that time without health insurance and despite the seriousness of her illness, Mr Neumann said.

"She officially said she was afraid to go back because of the father of her children. I told her she shouldn't be afraid because he's sitting in prison for [an unrelated] attempted murder," he

Asked by the Gazette why she refused to return, the mother cited a number of reasons, including that the cold weather was bad for her condition and that she didn't like the German mentality.

Meanwhile, the boy was spending more and more time with Mr Young. About a year and a half ago, the women noticed a change in his personality.

'He became very closed. He didn't talk to us anymore. Before he walked straight, but he started to walk a little bit lower every day, like something was very heavy on his shoulders. But he would not admit there was anything wrong," the sister said.

She visited Mr Young's house near Wat Suwansiriwong School in Patong on a number of

She visited the house around one year ago while her mother was back in hospital and noticed a table football game in the yard outside. There were also young boys outside the house. They seemed to like Mr Young a lot, she said. "I was seeing this and thinking 'what is going on?" she added.

Not wanting to stay home on her own while her sick mother was in hospital, she asked if she could stay at Mr Young's house and watch TV while he was out. She says she was told very firmly

"I started [to think] something must be in his house that they are scared of me seeing. And I talked to my brother again, I said 'Is something going on? I have a weird feeling here.' He said 'No!' and become very angry and very afraid. He didn't want to talk about this at all," she said.

The boy's mother and sister claim not to have known what was going on right up until the boy's arrest.

Around five weeks before the arrests, the boy told them the police visited Mr Young's house. Not having a warrant at the time, they didn't go inside. His mother asked the boy why. "I don't know, maybe they want to see the work permit or something like that," he reportedly replied.

On the evening of Friday, March 6, Mr Young was arrested. The police also summoned the boy to Kathu Police Station for questioning, but released him later that night.

Finally, after police had reviewed the evidence seized from Mr Young's house, they arrived at the family's Rawai home on the evening of March 9 to arrest the boy – but he was not home.

His mother said she called him and told him they were there to arrest him. She claims it was then that he told her, for the first time, that Mr Young had been abusing him for four years.

"From the beginning, he promised to protect me from my father," she says he told her. "He was afraid to lose his protection, and so he did not deny him. He said 'OK'. And when his father went back to Germany he wanted to finish the relationship. And Dax said 'No no no no. If you want to finish this, I'll go to your mom, and I'll tell her everything, and you know what will happen then. And I'll call your father in Germany, and he will come back."

But the family's account differs with that of Dirk Naumann on a number of points.

After the police visited Mr Young's house five weeks before the arrests, Mr Naumann talked to the boy at length.

"He came repeatedly here to my office. I talked to him repeatedly on the telephone, I talked to the mother repeatedly on the telephone, and before he was arrested, I knew all the story. He did not hold back anything, he told me exactly what he had done," he said.

Mr Naumann says he urged

the boy to return to Germany, but he refused. Knowing of his mother's determination not to go back he reportedly said, "I cannot leave my mum alone, my mum is my family."

Mr Naumann also suggests that the mother's children had supported her financially during her time in Phuket – an allegation she categorically denies.

German Ambassador Dr Hanns Schumacher visited the boy in Phuket Juvenile Observation and Protection Center on March 16.

"On a personal basis I was quite surprised when I met him, because knowing about the background that he has and where he comes from, he makes a very good impression," Dr Schumacher said.

The boy told him he had not been in school since the age of 13, he said.

Nevertheless, "he speaks well, he behaves very properly, he has an orderly appearance and I had the impression that if he was given the chance to do something serious... this guy would have no problems at all. He doesn't look like a criminal, and certainly not like a pedophile," Dr Schumacher said.

"He is hardened by his terrible experiences and he takes all the negative knocks in his life without much reaction, because he had so many," Mr Neumann added.

The ambassador was clear

on why the tragedy had happened. "I think that... this whole situation has arisen for two reasons. First, the really irresponsible behavior of the mother, who more or less prepared her stay here in Phuket and continued her stay without having the proper means. thus almost deliberately putting her children in danger to look for the money.

"And the second problem is a general problem, which should serve as a warning, and we want to serve it as a warning to all German nationals who are coming to Thailand to live here... don't come to Thailand permanently if you are not able to pay for your health insurance," he said.

Dr Schumacher and Mr Neumann said they had secured the boy's agreement to return and to persuade his mother to do like-

"I am neutral. I am not judging the family and I want to solve the case. That is the major approach and that is why we said 'If you want to go back to Germany, we have the means to support it, in co-operation with the police.' The police responded positively, and now we will work on this basis," Dr Schumacher said.

It remains to be seen if the boy's release can be secured. The family said they were told his next hearing would be in three months' time.

The mother remains seriosly ill but insists she does not want to return to Germany.



Govt in two minds over alcohol sales during Songkran

The Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) on March 11 issued two options for alcohol consumption during the Songkran Festival on April 12 to 14.

Deputy Public Health Minister Manit Nopamornbodi said the ministerial executives had come up with two ideas: ban all sale of alcohol during the entire period; or ban sale at stores but allow restaurants, pubs and hotels with an Excise Department permit to serve alcohol from 6 pm to midnight. The ministry will soon submit a report to the National Committee for Alcohol Consumption Control Policy for a final say, he added.

Disease Control Department Chief Somchai Chakrabhand said the ministry came up with these options after listening to all sides, including anti-alcohol groups, academics, manufacturers and business operators. The

idea was to control the impact of drinking rather than prohibit it altogether, though allowing alcohol to be sold at convenience stores or supermarkets will only encourage drunk driving, he said.

Public Health Minister Witthaya Kaewparadai, who presided over the meeting, said the MoPH wanted to save lives and reduce road accidents, and that it was not siding with manufacturers, traders or the anti-alcohol groups.

Stop Drink Network Coordinator Khamron Chudecha said it was wrong for the MoPH to leave such loopholes in its guidelines, because the ministry's first duty is to protect the public; not favour businesses. The network would call on Deputy PM Sanan Kachorn-prasart, chairman of the National Committee for Alcohol Consumption Control Policy, to clarify the issue, he said.

Purple notes for the elderly on April 9

Around 2.8 million elderly people, out of a total of four million eligible for the 500 baht monthly government allowance, have registered with authorities before the deadline ended on March 15.

Pending a final count of those who registered during the weekend, there would be another 200,000, making the total reach a possible three million, Social Development and Human Security Minister Issara Somchai said.

The next round of registration will open at a later date that is yet to be decided, he said. The first payment could be made starting on April 9 as planned. The first round of registrations opened on February 26 Only 700,800, around 10% of those

who are eligible, registered daily at the district offices throughout the country. The payment, a decision by the Abhisit government, has drawn flak from critics who say it is a populist policy and requires too large a budget in the current economic climate. Meanwhile, the Fiscal Policy Office under the Finance Ministry is working out a national welfare scheme to benefit all people over 60 years of age who were not employees or civil servants. Under the structure, 100 baht would be collected from each of the beneficiaries not older than 45 years following their consent for a minimum of 15 years. They will receive the amount in a lump sum when they turn 60.

HNRC urges PM to set up land reform council

Members of the National Human Rights Commission on March 16 urged the prime minster to set up a council to carry out comprehensive land reform to help poor people who have conflicts with the state over land ownership and usage rights.

The human rights commissioners met Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva at the Govern-

ment House to issue the demand.

They called on the prime minister to dissolve all government agencies responsible for handling land, because the agencies caused problems to the poor people. The new land reform council should be the sole agency to carry out land reform and the reform should be a national agenda, they proposed.

Hot dogs and rabies

Construction sites are the worst hotspots for rabid dogs in the capital, Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) Health Office Deputy Chief Wanthanee Wattana said on March 12.

Rabies has claimed the lives of three people in Bangkok this year, compared to just a single death for each of the past two years, she said. One of the victims in Bang Khunthien was a youth bitten by a puppy at a construction site, she said.

A survey has found that construction sites carry the biggest risk, as workers often raise dogs without having them vaccinated and let them roam freely. The BMA has started providing free rabies vaccinations and sterilization for pet dogs to try and deal with the problem, which is exacerbated by the summer heat.

Attempted murder by motorcycle

A teenaged street racer has been charged with attempted murder after he crashed his motorcycle into a senior traffic policeman while trying to evade a crackdown in Bangkok late Saturday night, March 14.

Captain Suraphol Daojaeng of Khoke Khram Police Station is undergoing hospital treatment for a broken right kneecap and awaiting results from a brain scan after he was knocked unconscious and bleeding from his head by the 15-year-old suspect, whose name was not released because he is a minor. The operation by more than 70 police around midnight at Kaset Nawamin Road netted 80 youths and 57 motorbikes. A total of 47 suspects, including 27 minors, were booked. The youngest was a 12-year-old boy.

4,000 more troops for Deep South

Security Operation Command (Isoc) is being boosted by an additional 4,000 troops in the Deep South, Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva said March 12.

Approval for the new troops, mostly paramilitary Rangers, was made in accordance with a new structure under Thailand's internal security law, he said.

The new troops will join Isoc's forward command.

Isoc is in the process of structural adjustment to make the Cold War era organization more effective under the current security situation, with priority going to the predominantly Muslim region.

Isoc received around 7 billion baht for its budget this year to help contain the violence. The government already has 60,000 troops deployed in the region.

"I have said clearly that if we still need this large budget and

DEEP SOUTH: The Internal level of human resources, it means our task in the Deep South has not yet succeeded," said Prime Minister Abhisit, who also serves as chief of Isoc. "When we are able to reduce resources and manpower in the region it will mean we are going in the right direction to win the hearts and minds of local people," he said.

> More than 3,200 people have been killed in the deep South since early 2004 as authorities struggle to contain the violence.

Prime Minister Abhisit said the government has tried to prevent people younger than 20 from joining the militant movement.

"We have to educate them and use the education to give them opportunities to improve their lives," he said. PM Abhisit said the government would discuss plans, measures and projects for youth education and development within a couple of weeks.

Child caught in crossfire

YALA: A nine-year-old boy was seriously injured after being shot during a gun fight between soldiers and suspected insurgents in Ramen District on the evening of March 13.

Police said that just before 8 pm, gunmen opened fire on an Army base inside Ban Phong Ta School in Tambon Kota Bahru. Soldiers returned fire and a gun battle raged for about five minutes, until the insurgents fled.

Soldiers then noticed 9-yearold student Asaming Wadae lying injured, with bullet wounds to the back and head.

Taken by soldiers to Ramen Hospital, he was later transferred to Yala Central Hospital, where he remains in critical condition.

Police said the attack was likely to have been launched to mark the anniversary of the establishment of Barisan Revolusi Nasional Melayu Patani, one of the many insurgent groups reportedly operating in the area, The group was established almost 50 years ago, on March 13, 1960.

Police believe Asaming was hit by bullets shot by the insurgents.

A few hours later, at around 2 am the following morning in neighbouring Pattani, suspected insurgents set fire to two schools in Nong Jik District.

Ban Tha Kamcham School in Tambon Tha Kamcham Village 1 and Ban Bang Than School in Tambon Bang Khao Village 3 both sustained considerable damage.

A wooden building housing classrooms for grades prathom one to prathom five at Ban Bang Than School was burned to the ground. The wooden Muslim prayer room at Ban Tha Kamchan School was also destroyed.

At both schools the perpetrators used spray paint to write "drive out the soldiers" on the wall.

Both schools had armed guards, but police say the arsonists broke in through back windows and used gasoline to fuel the flames.

Woman injured in acid attack

KRABI: A local politician and his mistress are in serious condition in Krabi Hospital after the politician's wife allegedly shot her husband and threw acid in the face of his lover on March 12, in Neua Khlong District.

The victims were identified by police as 37-year-old Somkiat Srisuwan, a member of Huay Yoong Tambon Administration Organization and his mistress, identified as 26-year-old Mrs Malathira Horbut. Witnesses reported seeing Mr Somkiat and Ms Malathira arrive at Mr Somkiat's house in Tambon Khok Yong at around 11:30 am.

Mr Somkiat lived at the home with his wife Phisamai Srisuk, 28. According to the report, when Mrs Phisamai saw her husband arrive home with another woman – after not having been home for three days – she flew into a jealous rage. First she grabbed some acid and threw it on the face and body of Mrs Malathira. When Mr Somkiat tried to help Mrs Malathira, Mrs Phisamai allegedly shot him once in the arm and once in the lower abdomen with a .38 calibre pis-

Witnesses said she appeared to be aiming for her husband's genitals. After the shooting, she then fled the scene and remains at large.

Video blackmail plan goes awry

schoolgirl for attempting to extort 50,000 baht from a classmate with a faked explicit video clip.

Na Yong Police arrested the girl, a matthayom five student, after the family of the victim called the police, who apprehended the suspect - who cannot be named for legal reasons – at school. They seized her mobile phone and found an edited video clip showing the victim naked. Police said that they also

TRANG: Police have arrested a found a recorded text message she had sent demanding the victim meet her in a public library and hand over 50,000 baht in return for not distributing the clip.

> The suspect said that she had seen a film about blackmailing someone with a faked clip.

> She wanted to raise money to go for special tutoring in Bangkok and to help out her family, who were struggling to meet mortgage and car finance payments. The girl already has a

record of trying to extort money, police said. In 2005, she was convicted of kidnapping the infant daughter of a Krabi judge and demanding a ransom of three million baht.

She was sentenced to two years imprisonment in Songkhla Juvenile Observation and Protection Center. After her release, she returned to live with her family in Trang. Teachers said the girl is a very bright student with a Grade Point Average of nearly 4.0.





A Celebration of Cultural Diversity

Food, fun and folk music from Lanta archipelago communities go on show at the region's annual Laanta Lanta Festival

he Laanta Lanta Festival is held annually on Koh Lanta Yai during the month of March. The event celebrates the eclectic mix of cultures and traditions that are found across the island. In a world where so many nations are divided by religious and cultural differences, it is inspiring to behold this crucible of cultures, where people reside together in peace and harmony.

The Koh Lanta archipelago is made up of more than fifty small islets, most of which are uninhabited. Koh Lanta Yai is the most popular with tourists and also has the largest population. The island's topography consists mainly of abundant forest land, mountainous terrain, pristine beaches and plentiful marine resources. Koh Lanta's original name was Palau Satak, which means 'long beach island' in Malay. In 1917 it was officially changed to Koh Lanta – thought to have come from the Javanese word for 'fish grill'. Lanta Old Town, located on the south-east coast, is worth a visit at any time of the year. Once a major sea port and the commercial center for the island, it provided a safe harbor for Arabic and Chinese trading vessels, sailing between Phuket, Penang and Singapore.

The town's status changed fifty years ago with the advent of roads and automobiles, which linked the island with the mainland – now tourism and fishing provide the main source of income for the locals. Despite the growing tourist industry, Lanta Old Town retains its quaint charm. Sino-style wooden shop fronts and stilted houses are evidence of a rich history as well as the diverse mix of cultures residing in the area. The Old Town is

home to three main ethnic groups: *Chao Ley* (Sea Gypsies), Thai-Muslim and Thai-Chinese. The *Chao Ley* preceded the Malay (Muslim) immigrants, while the Chinese merchants arrived more than 100 years ago.

The Chao Ley have occupied the area for over 500 years, settling along the coast in houses built upon stilts. They are unique in that they speak their own language, have animist beliefs and retain close ties with the sea. Thai-Muslims make up the majority of the population and the Thai-Chinese settlers have assimilated into the local community, working as business owners, agricultural farmers and fishermen. There is no religious tension between these groups and they have managed to coexist in peace and harmony for hundreds of years. The ethnic diversity is reflected in the old Sino-style houses, mosques, Buddhist temples and traditional Thai housing styles, all over the island. The Laanta Lanta Festival is held each year as a celebration of this unique community spirit. This year, locals and visitors congregated to enjoy an array of cultural facets still prevalent on the island today. Festivities commenced on March 7 – lasting three days and nights – featuring music, dance, cultural performances and markets.

Glowing red Chinese lanterns illuminated the streets while the aroma of incense and spice filled the night air. Vendors lined the town's streets, as locals and tourists browsed the waterside stalls and admired the old wooden Chinese shopfronts. Craftsmen and artists from the surrounding area exhibited a variety of goods, including leather, jewelery, *batik* and a miscellany of souvenirs.

The Old Town's melting pot of cultures is well represented in

the local cuisine. Aromatic flavors, originating from India, Malaysia and China are infused in a variety of dishes, such as Chinese noodles in fish curry (*Kanom Chine*) and Malaysian style chicken with yellow rice and roasted spices (*Khao Mok Gai*). The vibrancy and freshness of the ingredients alone is enough to whet your appetite. Bright yellow juicy corns, freshly caught fish and exotic juices served in bam-

boo beakers tantalized the tastebuds of passing shoppers. The main stage stood illuminated by the water's edge, while smaller cultural displays of music and dance took place close to the Old Town Museum. The first act to take to the main stage was Assalee Mala, a band known throughout Thailand for its traditional Thai Rong Ngeng folk music. Rong Ngeng is a style of folk music and dance incorporating Western style dance steps with music played on violins, Arabian drums and Chinese gongs, all accompanied by Malaysian lyrics. Rong Ngeng has been popular on Koh Lanta for over a century and is often played at weddings, festivals and by sea gypsies. There have been many recent attempts to keep the music alive, particularly on Koh Lanta and in other Southern areas of Thailand. The band's violinist, known as "Mac", explained, "We enjoy playing all over Thailand but we love playing in Koh Lanta and close to the Malaysian border. The music originates from here so there is always a great atmosphere." Mac also alluded to what makes the Laanta Lanta Festival special. "The amazing mix of culture and traditions makes it an exciting experience. You can try so many different styles of food and hear a variety of music. It is fun for everyone involved. Tourists can learn a lot about the interesting history of this island and take home some great memories," he said.

The festival was an impressive and enjoyable showcase of the cultural diversity of Koh Lanta. Most importantly, it is a positive example to the world, showing how people of different ethnic groups can live together peacefully and respectfully.

In a slight departure from our usual 'Cheap Eats' format, in which we might point you in the direction of one of Phuket's many excellent eateries, this week we offer an introduction – or a reminder, depending on how long you have been hiding out on the island – to some of the tastiest food to be found in Phuket. And what's more, we practically guarantee that you could be enjoying it in less time than it takes for me to finish writing this sentence.

Okay... maybe not quite that quick, but you get my point. Enjoy.

Street food I desire

iving in Phuket we are blessed with an almost inexhaustible range of mouthwatering options when it comes to choosing where to eat.

From the cheap-and-cheerful noodle soup carts, serving up steaming bowls of goodness, to high-end establishments, such as Tre Restaurant at Banyan Tree or the newly opened Acqua, which offer gourmet wonders – albeit with a price to match.

As delectable as the fare at these up-market restaurants may be – and believe you me, it is divine – some of the very best meals can be found by the side of the road or on street corners, where Thais congregate in large numbers, with a few astute expats dotted in between, to enjoy the simple things in life; good Thai cuisine.

To the newcomer to Thailand, particularly one on a short holiday, these establishments might seem daunting. Often the proprietors speak little or no English and the menus, if present at all, are usually written only in Thai.

Such obstacles are often enough to send all but the doughtiest diner scrambling for the nearest restaurant advertising a hearty English breakfast.

This, however, needn't be the case. With a few carefully memorized phrases, you can confidently stride into any local restaurant and order any amount of great food that won't strain the purse strings.

In this edition of Cheap Eats, I have selected four simple,

yet well-known dishes that can be found at most local eateries.

Phad Thai Gai (Thai-style stir-fried noodles with chicken)

Combining stir-fried rice noodles with egg, fish sauce, tamarind juice, red chillies, bean sprouts, crushed peanuts and coriander, *Phad Thai* is a popular favorite with many expats and countless backpackers who populate Bangkok's Khao San Road.

This simple-yet-classic dish is thought to have originated in Vietnam, being brought to the ancient Thai capital of Ayuthaya by Vietnamese traders.

It was made popular in the Kingdom by Luang Phibunsong-khram, Thailand's prime minister in the 1930s and 1940s.

The promotion of the dish was partly due to his Thai nationalism campaign and partly in a bid to cut down rice consumption in the Kingdom.

Phad Thai can be accompanied by pork, prawns or a combination of seafood, but works particularly well with chicken. The addition of a little fish sauce (nam pla) and some dried chilli flakes gives the dish a delicious finish.

Kuitiaw Naam Nua (Noodle soup with beef)

An extremely popular dish, *Kuitiaw Naam* can be found at a variety of places, including street vendors, canteens and food courts.

Originally thought to have come from China – a country with many varieties of noodle



soup – the name itself is taken from the Chinese word *Teochew*. Unlike most Thai dishes, *Kuitiaw Naam* is generally eaten with chopsticks – another Chinese influence.

An ode to simplicity, the noodles – often rice noodles – are served in a chicken broth and are often topped with coriander and finely sliced fried onions.

The dish is often finished with meat or fish balls, but with beef is particularly delicious.

As with many Thai dishes, you can add condiments – fish sauce, dried chillies and chillies in vinegar – to taste.

Khao Pad Moo (Thai-style fried rice with pork)

Rice is synonymous with Thailand. It is eaten everywhere and is exported to countless countries around the globe. *Khao Pad* is a variety of fried rice that is prepared in the style of central Thailand cuisine.

Khao Pad differs from Chinese fried rice as, traditionally, it uses Jasmine rice instead of long-grain rice. The rice is stirfried with a meat, eggs, onions, tomatoes, green onions, coriander and fried garlic. To season, chefs will use soy sauce, sugar, salt and naturally, fish sauce.

Once prepared, the dish is accompanied by sliced cucumber, tomato and lime.

Delicious with any meat, it goes particularly well with pork and never better than when topped with a *Kai Dao* (fried egg), a finishing touch that complements so many Thai dishes. To add extra flavor, take advantage of the condiments at the table.

Pad See Ew Pla Murg (Fried

broad noodles with soy sauce and squid)

Another dish that has its origins in China. The "See Ew" part refers to the dark soy sauce that the dish is named after (nam See Ew) and is also taken from the Chinese word Teochew.

A popular street food, as well as being prevalent in many restaurants, the dish is made with light and dark soy sauces, garlic, broad rice noodles (sen yai), Chinese Broccoli (Kai-lan) and egg. Often served with thinly sliced meat – chicken or pork are popular – it is also delicious with squid (Pla Murg), which is readily available in Asia and comes fresh from the sea.

So there we have it; a few simple but delicious choices that, hopefully, you can feel confident enough to order in your local eatery. Tuck in!



A fond farewell to a good governor

had the pleasure of meeting Dr Preecha several times in the five months that he held the position of Governor of Phuket. Upon our first meeting in his office at Pro-

vincial Hall, it soon became apparent that Dr Preecha is a nononsense man who makes quick, informed decisions. He's also a down-to-earth idealist with a firm grip on reality and a predilection for fairness. He was open about how different his governorship in Phuket would be to that of his time as Governor of Pichit and that the move to Phuket brought with it many challenges that he'd not faced before.

Dr Preecha didn't just pick up the Phuket gauntlet, he ran with it, and was soon appearing all over the province as he worked to familiarize himself with the island's geography, communities and industries.

In Pichit, Dr Preecha would deal with issues such as rice production and other matters arable but in Phuket, he suddenly had so many more issues on his plate, such as drug-related crimes, traffic and pollution, utility supply and disasters, and the fact that Phuket is often under the international spotlight with its multitude of foreign visitors and the sometimes bizarre events that surround them.

Unperturbed, Dr Preecha took all these new tasks in his stride – strides that took him all over the island as he made a name for himself as someone who mucks in – unafraid to roll up his sleeves and get his hands dirty.

Although Dr Preecha's tenure in Phuket was brief, he quickly became known as a man who can wear many hats. When preventative measures were taken against the threat of bird flu, Governor Preecha put on a protective suit and got down to the business of disinfecting poultry farms.

Later in the same week, he suited up in scuba diving gear for the first time in his life to observe the progress of the sinking of the Coral Reef Squadron. Wherever he went, Dr Preecha could be seen interacting with locals on all levels, from farmers and community leaders to entrepreneurs, civic groups and government officials. This very quickly gave Dr Preecha a broad perspective on

what makes Phuket tick and he was quick to act in the interests of the island's people and businesses – making decisions with a view to ensuring long-term sustainability of the province.


Regardless of the behindthe-scenes political maneuvering that has brought Dr Preecha's Phuket governorship to an abrupt end, there's no question that Dr Preecha is a hard-working man who put his heart and soul into leading the people of Phuket.

He had the best interests of Phuket and her citizens at heart and understands the importance of the island's image in the eyes of the international media, doing whatever he could to improve things for everybody.

ndy Dowden's love of sailing Astarted during his school days as an engineering student at the University of Bath in England.

"Like a lot of young students, I headed to the Greek Isles during school breaks and hung out on the beaches. I was immediately impressed with the yachting and decided I wanted to somehow combine my engineering studies with a life on the sea," he says.

After graduation, Andy worked for eight years as a structural engineer on projects with a marine focus. He saved his money and in his free time sailed around the south coast of England and also to the north France. In 1982, he bought a 46 ft custom built sloop, Buccabu, and set off to sail around the world. He didn't get too far before disaster struck.

"We worked our way around the Mediterranean, but in the Gulf of Eilat a tug struck us and we sank. We spent the next year rebuilding. Actually, the experience only deepened my commitment to sailing."

By 1984, Buccabu had arrived in Phuket.

"I immediately thought I had found the greatest place in the world. I liked the food, the people and the culture. There was very little boat chartering in local waters and I was soon offered

the chance to be the resident boat charter operator for the Pansea Resort, which is now The Chedi."

These were the early days for yachting around Phuket. Together with other local yachties - Bill O'Leary, Jan Jacobs and Vincent Tabuteau – Andy went to work refitting converted rice barges into charter vessels. By 1989, he was General Manager of Phuket Yacht Services, the region's first company offering professional yacht services. The company soon won a contract to manage Sunsail, the international yacht charter franchise.

Andy built some of Phuket's legendary charter boats, including the Manohra, the Maha Bhetra and the June Bahtra.

He was also part of the committee that managed the King's Cup Regatta in the early years by handling the local logistics for Phuket. He is known for his ability to organize race courses, and by 2002 had become Phuket President for the King's Cup.

He then decided to move into new directions within the vachting community.

"I saw the opportunities of launching a professional boat show that would attract the world community. I joined with Grenville Fordham and we created Image Asia. While Grenville focused on the publishing side of the business,

I worked on creating Phuket's first international boat exhibition, PIMEX.

PIMEX was an immediate success due to the many personal contacts that Andy had developed over the years.


"There was great interest in yachting around Phuket at that time as the [previously prohibitive] boat import duties were reduced to zero. I had worked with others for two years to convince the government to lower the duties, which had been over 200 percent, to allow foreign investors the opportunity to invest in fleets."

Andy took over PIMEX in 2006 and moved it to the upscale Royal Phuket Marina (RPM) where it continued to attract international attention. He sold the rights to PIMEX to the INFORMA Yacht Group which operates the prestigious Monaco Yacht Show. Andy is now the Phuket based manager not only for PIMEX but also for other events that occur at the RPM's International Exhibition and Conference Center.

Andy has served as Chairman of the British Business Association for five years. He helped to produce SAIL Thailand and Andaman Sea Pilot, the definitive guide to local waters, and he is currently Chairman of the Race Committee for Image Asia's increasingly popular Phuket Race



SHE hatches Easter egg project

ritish couple Mark and Sharon Biddell, cofounders of SHE (Self Help and Empowerment) are busy trying to supply the people of Phuket with chocolate eggs in time for Easter.

The eggs are handmade and individually decorated by a team of women who came to the foundation for support and the opportunity of earning a decent and fair wage.

Set up by the Biddells in 2002, SHE is a non-profit organization aimed at helping vulnerable women trapped in the sex industry in Patong.

A program was put in place to teach these women new skills so that they could make positive changes in their lives.

Since the foundation began, the women have been making jewelery. The market has been primarily overseas and all proceeds are ploughed back into the foundation.

Most of the women who have been involved in the program are from the rural areas such as Esarn.

Once they have had suffi-

cient time at the center to re-adjust and prepare themselves for the next stage of their lives, many of the women return to their villages.

The foundation gives them the opportunity to set up their own small businesses by providing the women with resources to take back home and make the jewelery from there.

"That way, the women can be at home with their families and kids where they belong," said Mark.

SHE is a long-term project that focuses on helping women gain life skills and good work ethics, leading to financial independence.

For Mark and Sharon, it is also important that the work done by the foundation is progressive.


A recent innovation is the Easter egg project. SHE will be the first organization to manufacture and sell Easter eggs in Phuket.

It doesn't end there – Sharon thought that if they were making eggs, why not make chocolate treats that can be consumed all year round?

From their premises in Kathu, the team is now creating

individually handcrafted chocolates. Slabs of high quality Dutch chocolate are melted down into moulds with various flavorings and fillings.

They use milk chocolate and white chocolate. Each chocolate is then painstakingly decorated by hand.

As well as making the chocolates, the women are also producing a line of uniquely designed boxes to put them in. There are four different box sizes; the largest holding 16 chocolates and the smallest just one.

Using handmade *saa* paper from Chang Mai, the women can make up to seven of the large boxes in a single day.

The foundation recently opened a shop in Big C to sell the chocolates. Sharon and Mark are hoping that local shops and cafes will also choose to stock their products.

"The outlets can take the goods on consignment.

They don't have to pay anything up-front and will earn commission on anything they sell, so it's a win-win situation," explained Sharon.

Perfection Cafe on Chao Fa East Rd is already stocking the chocolates and Sharon says that this sends out a positive message to the local community.

By selling and promoting these handmade goods they are helping the local economy.

The chocolates are solid, giving them a lifespan of one year and do not need to be refrigerated.

However, they do also make coconut filled ones that Sharon says are a popular favorite.

In the coming weeks, Sharon will be training some of the women to take their products out and market them to the hotels in and around Phuket.

The boxes can be personalized with the hotel logo, which they could then use as promotional gifts for special customers, or sell in the hotel shop.

"This is a way for hoteliers to show people that they are putting something back into the community, while at the same time, promoting their own hotel.

The boxes are very attractive so customers are likely to hang on to them even after all the chocolates are finished," said Sharon

An American company called Mission Passport also thinks the boxes are very attractive.

A charity selling lots of different products from cosmetics to silk scarves all across the US, they will be using SHE's boxes as packaging for everything they

"For the time being, they will be placing an order of 200 a month," said Sharon.

"We're really pleased that the women's work will be promoted in America but also that all the money will be going back into the Thai economy," she added.

As a future project, Mark and Sharon would like to see the box-making take off in the Esarn area

The idea is that this would provide the local women with a decent income and maybe prevent them from coming to Phuket to join the sex industry.

Penetrating the Coral Reef Squadron

he first two columns have solely focused upon learning to dive: how to go about it and some general concerns. I shall return and cover continued education at a later date, but last week I did something that I hadn't done for a long time: I went diving! In the latter part of 2008, much was made about the creation of an artificial reef in Bang Tao Bay, using sunken planes and helicopters to create a new ecosystem.

It is remarkable how quickly man-made structures become home to a large amount of fish and colors. Indeed many wrecks encountered in relatively shallow waters have been covered with some of the most beautiful corals I have ever seen – anyone who has dived the SS Yongala in Australia will know where I'm coming from. Wreck diving is a particular passion of mine and the driving force behind my decision to get my Tec Deep certification.

Ships and planes that sank unintentionally naturally capture the imagination more than purpose-sunk vessels, but the thrill – although slightly diminished when diving the latter – remains constant. The years spent working as a dive professional in and around the Asia-Pacific region have given me access to some stunning wrecks. It is a thrilling – yet at the same time haunting – experience to descend down a



mooring line and suddenly be confronted by the dark silhouette of a once proud ship, looming up from the depths below.

Each and every wreck has a history and its own story to tell; how it came to rest upon the bottom of the sea is just another chapter in its life. Uncovering a ship's past is part of what draws you in. Penetration allows you to glimpse back in time and appreciate how people would have lived and worked on a daily basis

Despite the excitement felt when diving on a wreck, it can also be a somber affair. Warships in particular remind you that people died on board their vessels, the ships becoming their tombs for eternity. Bearing that in mind, it is important to show one's respect. So with a lack of nitrogen coursing around my veins and arteries, I headed out

with H2O Sportz of Cherng Talay to see what the Coral Reef Squadron had to offer after just a few months. After mooring the boat, kitting up and entering the water, we descended beneath the waves and down the buoy line to the bottom. The visibility was reasonably good, and after just a few meters, the outline of one of the planes became clear. It was evident even from the first few minutes during our descent that an ecosystem was already beginning to form. Molluscs were clinging to the line, and a number of longfin bannerfish darted back and forth.

The wrecks lie at a depth of approximately 22 meters. Visibility can vary from no more than a couple of meters to around a maximum of 10. The currents, although not a major problem, can be fairly strong. The depth of the wrecks makes the site a prime

candidate for diving with nitrox (enriched air – replacing some nitrogen with additional oxygen) allowing a diver to extend their no decompression limits. Because of the depths involved, the limited visibility and the potential for strong currents, the Coral Reef Squadron is suited to more advanced divers. Without the benefit of a guide, combined with worsening visibility, navigating around the site proved to be tricky, although not impossible. A guide is highly recommended.

All of the wrecks have been cut open and allow for plenty of penetration – generally the most enjoyable part of searching any wreck. Swimming inside, sadly all the innards have been gutted, robbing the wrecks of character, but it is possible to squeeze into the limited space of the cockpits and imagine you are sitting where air force pilots once sat. As one

would expect, the planes and helicopters are slowly accumulating silt, but already colorful tube worms and sponges are growing inside and out. Large schools of rabbit fish and Indo-Pacific sergeant majors constantly swim through the shells. Elsewhere, beautiful yet deadly lionfish are marking their territory, while an ever-comical looking starry pufferfish slowly cruises back and forth, eyes bulging, mouth agape.

Given that the squadron only came to rest just a few months ago, a large amount of life has already set up camp within the wrecks. It takes many years for corals to form, so it will take some time before the Coral Reef Squadron becomes a top-class dive site, but a steady accumulation of marine life over the years will make it a popular site to visit for years to come.

A last minute deal with Honda

n recent months the teams have been testing; in Portugal, Spain and Bahrain as well as other remote places such as Adria, north of Bologna. But of more significance; the winter has seen a raft of changes in terms of the regulations, while we have also lost the Honda factory team, as well as its satellite operation Super Aguri, which closed

its doors last May. Fortunately, a last minute deal with Honda has seen the team renamed Brawn GP – owned and run by hugely experienced engineer Ross Brawn – with Jenson Button

and Rubens Barrichello retained for a further season. Engines, however, will be supplied by Mercedes-Benz and not Honda. ther he can repeat the triumph – and perhaps, in addition, secure the Constructors' Championship for McLaren. Hamilton will be

The latest cars feature restricted aerodynamics compared with last year's monstrosities; they are also permitted to run KERS, or kinetic energy recovery system, which uses braking

energy to create an additional power source. While it is permitted, it is not mandatory and not all teams will run with the system from the beginning of the season.

Last November, Britain's Lewis Hamilton clinched the World Drivers' Championship with a last-ditch effort in Brazil, which saw him pass Timo Glock's

ailing Toyota on the last lap to take the one point needed to snatch the title away from Felipe Massa. As Hamilton now heads into his third season of F1, all eyes will be on him to see whe-

ther he can repeat the triumph – and perhaps, in addition, secure the Constructors' Championship for McLaren. Hamilton will be joined by team mate Heikki Kovalainen again who scored his maiden victory in Hungary last year.

Over at Red Bull, Mark Webber is joined by Sebastian Vettel, winner of the Italian Grand Prix in 2008, who replaces the now-retired David Coulthard. Also owned by Red Bull billionaire Dietrich Mateschitz is Scuderia Toro Rosso which has retained Frenchman Sebastian Bourdais, and who is joined by 20-year old Swiss driver Sebastien Buemi.

There is no change at Ferrari, with 2007 champion Kimi Räikkönen and 2008 runner-up Felipe Massa behind the wheel, while at Williams, Renault and BMW Sauber, their respective line-ups remain unchanged. Toyota too has kept Jarno Trulli and Timo Glock. Trulli, in particular, believes 2009 will be Toyota's chance to come good.

"I hope we can build on the progress we showed in 2008 and challenge for the team's first win. Formula 1 is a team game, you win and lose together, and Toyota did a very good job last year which allowed me to be competitive and fight at the front. I am full of hope for this season. You need to build strong foundations before you can win.

It is like a house; you cannot start by building the roof. We have established the foundations and I believe we can build a winning team. In 2008 we made a huge improvement and took a big step in the right direction so I hope now this year we can be a top team. I am confident in my own ability, so if I am given a competitive car I know I can deliver the results," he said.

Meanwhile, BMW Sauber is equally confident of greater success in 2009. BMW Motorsport Director Mario Theissen reinforces the point. "We have set ourselves the task of further improving our performance relative to the rest of the field. The one-

two in Canada and eleven podium finishes in 2008 set an exacting standard. In 2009 we are looking to maintain our first-class reliability record while also enhancing our performance levels so that we can be at the front of the pack on a consistent basis.

Ferrari and McLaren possess vast reserves of experience and have been operating at the top level for many years. That's what our highly motivated team are setting out to emulate – through hard work and efficiency, coupled with our calm, analytical approach to the job," he said.

Kimi Räikkönen, after – by his standards – a lackluster 2008 season, with just two wins, will be hoping to put that right this year. "This is my third season with Ferrari and I'm motivated and I want to win, as usual," Kimi said. "Last year didn't go as I wanted, especially during the second half of the season. But we learned a lot. I feel fine at Ferrari, otherwise I wouldn't be here today. I'm convinced that it was the right choice when I came to join the team," he added

Testing in Bahrain in February, Ferrari experienced some problems with its KERS, but Kimi remains upbeat. "Until today, the car's development went well, although we were mainly concentrating on its behavior and the tires," Kimi said. "We had a problem with the cooling system of the KERS, but these things can happen during the tests. Anyway we drove many laps.

The whole car improved during these tests, but it's still too early to say where we are compared to our competitors. I think we have to wait until Melbourne for that. One of the novelties for this year, compared to last sea-

son is that I have a good feeling on the slick tires. I think the teams all seem very closely matched and this makes me think that the coming season will be particularly close," he added

So, can Lewis Hamilton repeat his championship year? The man himself believes so. "I feel more relaxed going into the season simply because I've come off a great season. It is like when you go from race to race – when you win one race the next one you have gives you extra confidence. I feel I have reset my goals, and reset my targets back to when I started in Formula One. I want to be world champion," he said.

growth rate of this magnitude is far in excess of any other economy in the world. It is not being viewed around the world with envy; it is something of an oasis in a worldwide desert. Even the rumor that

the Chinese Premier was to announce a second stimulus package was enough to rally global stockmarkets desperate for some good news.

The Chinese economy is going to have to become more reliant on domestic demand quickly as exports come under significant pressure.

China, when compared with the US and a number of other countries, has some great advantages. When the government tells the banks to maintain a high level of lending, they are able to comply, not only because of potential re-

percussions, but from the simple fact that they are solvent.

Generally speaking, China has no exposure to the 'toxic banking products' so prevalent in many – mainly Western – banks. Some Sovereign Wealth Funds in the Middle East and Asia wish

they had never heard of these Western banks.

China's population knows that if they have health or retirement problems they have, for all practical purposes, to be self-financing. The government is going to contribute very little. The Chinese, on average (in China), save an es-

timated 30% of their income. This is an enormous percentage. To offer a comparison, the US savings rate, in recent years, has been negative. Only the current recession, with all its factors, has raised the savings rate into posi-

tive territory. Thousands of companies in China have gone out of business, especially exporters in Southern China. The Chinese government's optimistic view is at odds with many Chinese business people who are far more pessimistic. They often cite falling domestic demand, which shows little sign of an immediate improvement. It is no easy task to turn an economy in which exports have been so prevalent into one where the domestic economy is the driving force; even more so when dealing with a population of 1.3 billion people.

However, China still lacks infrastructure and this is one area to which vast sums of money are headed. With US\$ 1.9 trillion in foreign exchange reserves, China has the world's largest and a currency that is not convertible, allowing the Chinese Government to fix the exchange rate.

It is indicative of the times that the new US Secretary of State's visit included China on her first tour abroad. It is also noteworthy that no mention was made to China about human rights – America has no wish to antagonize their largest investor in US Government Securities.

The Chinese stockmarkets in Shanghai and Shenzhen had a

terrible 2008, losing over 60% of their index value. There has since been something of a recovery but it is too early to predict if the market has truly reached the bottom. Many investors in Chinese stockmarkets lost all their savings and many more suffered huge losses. It is fair to say that many Chinese will never want to hear the term 'stockmar-ket' again.

The reality is, that if the government and the private sector can attain 8% GDP growth this year, a stockmarket rally cannot be too far away. This 8% figure stated by the Chinese government is of great importance. Many global economists believe this is the minimum rate of economic growth required in China to maintain a steady path of employment. Any less, and the opinion is widely held that unemployment will rise.

The Chinese government seems to quietly agree with this assessment and another commonly held theory amongst analysts is that rising unemployment will lead to civil unrest, something that must always be of concern in a dictatorship. China's neighbors are also keeping their fingers crossed that the "800-pound gorilla" maintains its economic and social poise. Japan, still the world's second largest economy,

is ever more reliant on China as a market for investment, exports and reasonably cheap manufacturing. South Korea, the only Asian economy to have something of a domestic credit bubble, is also increasingly reliant on China to hopefully cover some of the loss in exports to other markets.

China, however, has now entered a period of deflation. Currently standing at -1.6% year-on-year as of February 2009, it is a stark comparison to February 2008 when inflation was in evidence at 8.7%. While this certainly gives China the ability to further reduce interest rates, it makes that 8% growth target more elusive.

Even with China keeping its economy out of recession, this is not sufficient to have any significant effect on the global picture. The Chinese economy is only about one third the size of the US. It is likely that, when we emerge from this global downturn, Asia will enjoy an even more important role on the world stage.

One interesting statistic: domestic Chinese auto sales in February 2009 jumped by an impressive 20%. Usually, this is a very reliable indicator in any economy.

The Man Booker Fraud

he Man Booker Prize is the most prestigious award in the literary world, dwarfing the American National Book Award. Just to be shortlisted for the Man Booker is a great honor.

Aravind Adiga's *The White* Tiger (Atlantic Books, London, 2008, 321pp) won the award in 2008, and how this clunky, meanspirited midget of a book accomplished that, I'll never know. Maybe the judges were attracted by the lefty politics - which smacks of Soviet-style socialist realism - in its divide of suffering poor and greedy rich.

Adiga is blunt in his dichotomy. The poor live in 'The Darkness', the rich, 'The Light'. Balram Halwai is so poor he doesn't have a name.

He's just called "Munna" or "Boy" from birth. In his school the teacher doesn't teach. He sits at his desk, drunk and asleep, or chewing and spitting betel nut. Balram's father is a rickshaw puller who dies in the hospital because the doctors don't come to work. The leading politician is the 'Great Socialist', who lambastes the rich.

Balram tells his tale in a long letter to Wen Jiabao, the Premier of China, who has come to India on a state visit. The subject is the nature of Indian capitalism. Balram has risen to become a successful entrepreneur in the outsourcing capital of Bangalore.

He was born in a dirt-poor village called Laxmangarh, which is owned by four greedy landlords nicknamed the Buffalo, the Stock. the Wild Boar, and the Raven. Balwan's first job is in a tea shop in the coal mining town of Dhanbad.

"Go to a tea shop anywhere along the Ganga, sir, and look at the men working in that tea shop

– men, I say, but better to call them human spiders that go crawling in between and under the tables with rags in their hands,

crushed humans in crushed uniforms, sluggish, unshaven, in their thirties or forties or fifties but still 'boys'. But that is your fate if you do your job well with honesty, dedication, and sincerity, the way Gandhi would have done it, no doubt," Adiga wrote. "I did

my job with near total dishonesty, lack of dedication, and insincerity - and so the tea shop was a profoundly enriching experi-

His big break comes when he lands a job as a driver to the rich, American-educated son of the Stork, Ashok and his wife Pinky Madam. He drives the sec-

luxury sedan, is driven by his mean-spirited boss, Ram Persad, who pretends to be a pious Hindu.

> When Balram discovers his true identity as a Muslim, he blackmails him into fleeing in disgrace. A few days later, new chief driver Balram conveys his master and mistress to their new home in New Delhi, Buckingham Towers two. He has truly entered into 'The Light'. His jobs include

cooking, cleaning, and washing the two poodles, Cuddles and Puddles, and the feet of the visiting Stork.

"You'll have to come here and see it for yourself to believe it. Every day millions wake up at dawn - stand in dirty, crowded buses - get off at their masters' posh houses – and then clean the

ond, ordinary car. The first, the floors, wash the dishes, weed the garden, feed their children, press their feet – all for a pittance. I will never envy the rich of America or England, Mr Jiabao: they have no servants there. They cannot even begin to understand what a good life is," wrote Adiga.

Through theft, murder and bribery, Balram claws his way to the top. All the people he encounters – rich and poor – are cruel, callous, nasty, belligerent and pig-

There isn't a single attractive character and hardly any humor. Balram does crank out some aphorisms.

"The dreams of the rich, and the dreams of the poor - they never overlap, do they? See, the poor dream all their lives of getting rich. And what do the rich dream of? Losing weight and looking like the poor," the author

You wonder at the end why Aravind is so angry and bitter? Was it his own poor childhood in India? No, he was born in India but grew up in Australia. He just hits the right notes for lefty

When less is definitely not more

Welcome to Word Court, where Barbara Wallraff unravels some of the mystery that shrouds the English language, debunking confusing usage and clearing away the clutter that prevents clear understanding – all by answering readers' questions.

As you're obviously aware, 'fewer' is for things we can count, so it's the right word to use with most plurals - for instance, 'items' and 'interruptions'. 'Less' is for things that come in amounts, not numbers – for instance, 'stuff' and 'trouble'.

Until you wrote, I thought we were making progress with this distinction.

In a supermarket I go to, the sign on the express lane now reads "10 items or fewer". Evidently we've made, ahem, less progress in fewer situations than I dared hope.

Q: Can you comment on the overuse of the word 'amazing'? ruptions'. Every time I hear it, the It seems I cannot tune in to a TV or radio show without hearing this word. No one ever clarifies or describes what is 'amazing'. I instantly change the channel at the first use of this word, and sometimes that is 15 seconds into the

Barbara replies: 'Amazing', 'awesome', 'stunning', 'incredible', 'unbelievable', 'fabulous', 'unique' – these are all words that have been subject to inflation over time.

To be literally amazed is a powerful experience – as it is to be awed, stunned or unable to believe one's senses, to feel as if something belongs in a fable or to come across something that's the only one of its kind.

It's only natural that people will sometimes overstate their case. For instance, anyone who doesn't know that most women would rather be told they look 'amazing' than told they look 'nice' hasn't been paying attention. There's no harm in such hyperbole until someone actually is amazed by something and wants to say so. Then the accurate word falls short.

The solution to the problem is, as you suggest, to describe what elicited amazement - to

"show, rather than tell", as writing teachers put it. Amazing someone the same way you were amazed is a much more direct way of communicating than just announcing what your response was. I'd love to give you an example. Unfortunately though, truly amazing things don't come along very often.

'Its first child' sounds creepy, so let's go with 'their first child'.

Because 'their' refers to 'couple' and is plural, the verb should be plural too: 'The couple were expecting their first child'.

This island needs special administrative status

The transfer of former Governor Preecha Ruangjan to Phitsanuloke came as little surprise to political observers, who expected a civil service reshuffle after the Democrat Party managed to form a coalition government.

More surprising is the revelation that Dr Preecha actually requested the transfer, ostensibly so he could govern a province where his background in agriculture would be put to better use than in a province like Phuket, with its tourism-dominated economy.

News of Dr Preecha's transfer request is perhaps a bit heart-breaking, given that his open and energetic style made him somewhat of a media darling during his short stay here – less than five months.

On his departure he received kind words from a number of local leaders, including Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwansupana, Phuket Provincial Administration Organization President Paiboon Upatising and former Phuket Chamber of Commerce President Eam Thavornwongwongse, who questioned why the local Democrat Party leaders hadn't lobbied to keep the popular governor in Phuket.

Of course, governors are appointed by the Interior Ministry, which is now controlled by the Bhumjaithai Party of Newin Chidchob loyalists. Given the history between Mr Newin and the Phuket Democrats, the chance that they could have had any influence in the matter is slim indeed.

Dr Preecha is not the first high-level civil servant to want out of Phuket. In December 2006, Provincial Chief Administrative Officer Nivit Aroonrat was granted a transfer to Samut Sakhon. A Phuket native, Mr Nivit admitted he had applied for the transfer because he was very tired of the hard work the job in Phuket entails.

It has also been reported in recent years that up to 10% of the island's police force had applied for transfers off the island. Taken collectively, these facts indicate that while Phuket maintains its allure to a wide range of foreigners, it really can be a hardship posting for high-ranking civil servants and law enforcement officials.

The *Gazette* wishes the best of luck to Dr Preecha as well as his replacement Wichai Phraisa-ngop, who will reach the mandatory retirement age for civil servants in just under a year – about the length of time it takes to come up to speed for such a post.

All of the facts mentioned here further underscore the need to establish Phuket as a special administrative zone like Bangkok and Pattaya, where the people have the right to elect their own governor – someone intimately familiar with the island and its many problems. This has been talked about for years, but is certainly no closer to becoming a reality with Newin and Friends in charge of the MoI.



Phuket preschools

It was with some dismay that I read your recent "Issues & Answers" regarding international preschool and nurseries. The answer implies that there are only four schools that have valid licenses. The four schools that are mentioned all run primary and secondary schools for children presumably from age six to 18 and beyond. As a small adjunct of their primary business, they also run a preschool for children aged six and below – children that are not old enough to fit into their regular school. As fully fledged schools, they have to be licensed by the Phuket Educational Service.

Preschools and nurseries in Phuket are instead licensed by the Phuket Provincial Government Authority's Department of Social Development and Welfare. These schools certainly do not measure up to the total quality of education available to, say, a 15year-old, but none of us pretends that this is the case. A preschool, by definition, tries to prepare a sixyear-old or younger to function in a primary school, thus gaining an advantage over their peers when they actually enter a primary school environment.

Not only are we at Buds fully licensed, but our building, playground and safety standards were recently re-inspected by four inspectors. Our staff and director have both undergone background checks and they have also received training and certificates in preschool and nursery childcare from Phuket Business Carring (sic) School. These certificates are a prerequisite in getting and keeping a license. We also carry liability insurance. I have attached a copy of both our

license and our director's childcare certificate.

Our preschool and nursery have taught in English for over 10 years. Because of our relatively small size we feel we do a much better job in preparing our young students for their later school experience compared to our larger competitors, who in some cases have hundreds of much older students and of course focus on their core business.

Better safe than sorry

Elliot Klein is the founder and Director of Operations for the Maximum Security Division of Saen Yim Co Ltd. Following the murder of a nanny and baby in Phuket in 2007, Elliot set up the company with the intention of educating homeowners, developers, builders, property managers and hoteliers that what they have come to believe to be

acceptable residential protection is, in reality, nothing more than a first step and quite incapable of stopping anyone with bad intentions and a minimal knowledge of criminal techniques. Elliot contends that the majority of residential break-ins and the resultant violence can be prevented by using proper and appropriate security measures. His avowed mission is to help Phuket achieve the reputation as 'Asia's safest vacation/investment destination'. Here he shares his thoughts on what needs to be done to reach that goal.

here have been ten murders and attempted murders in Phuket in the past two months. Maximum Security was started as a direct result of the murder of a nanny and baby in their home two years ago. Since then, we have tried strenuously to educate residents, developers and hotel management to understand the need for real security.

Like everywhere else, all of these community members here need a kick in the butt as far improving security goes. The blasé attitude of most of the population is a danger to individuals and potentially catastrophic to the economy – on which it can have a seriously negative effect.

There are over thirty specific elements critical to a security program for any home, development or high-rise building. Most of the facilities we have visited on 'Ride-Along' Security Inspections have less than five in place.

Having an alarm system on your windows and doors is a good start in a total security program. By itself, it merely serves to warn you that someone just entered your house, and will be where you are in about 30 seconds. If he or they have weapons, what do you plan on doing to protect you and your family?

Without a safe place that cannot be easily broken into, you are at great risk. Yet many people spend more on their swimming pool and LCD TV than on their security.

When you buy a car you want brakes, windshield wipers, seat belts and headlights. You want ABS, airbags, electronic stability and coded entry system. These eight elements working together make you safe on the road. So why would you have only a wall, door locks and an alarm system to protect you where you spend the majority of

Villa developments, apartment complexes, high rise buildings and hotel resorts also need a broad spectrum of deterrent, preventative and protective elements to keep their residents safe. Having security guards trained only to lift a bar across the driveway and how to use a walkie talkie or whistle does not qualify as the '24-hour security' advertised. Likewise, installing CCTV cameras around the property without having personnel trained to respond efficiently and effectively is the same as having no cameras

New home buyers in the UK, EU and the US all continue to list good security as their number one priority for their prospective properties, yet the level of security offered to these same buyers in Phuket is negligible.

Ultra high-end properties in Phuket are prime targets for illegal activities, particularly those catering to celebrity buyers. The extensive advertising they do describing their elegance and luxury also announces to the criminals that this is where the money is. These places need to implement the most intense security measures to protect their residents, yet they continue to provide only the absolute minimum of available techniques and equipment.

Often, security staff, which is the keystone element of any multi-unit security program, are woefully under trained in the essential procedures of screening at entry points, monitoring CCTV activity, patrolling and observation, threat assessment and situation control.

What good is it having security staff if, when an incident occurs, they do not have sufficient training or ability to know how to react?

Our goal is to ensure that all of us have a safe and prosperous community for years to come. This is only possible if people best positioned to change the overall level of community security stop living in cloud cuckoo land; pretending that they and their residents/guests will never be victims of crime. Wouldn't it be a spectacular marketing tool if Phuket were universally lauded for being the 'safest vacation destination in Asia'?

The idea for both private properties and multi-unit properties is to make the outermost perimeter as formidable as possible so that the criminal thinking about breaking in can plainly see that it will be very difficult. In most cases he will move on and look for an easier target.

Should he decide to attempt a break-in, there needs to be a series of protective layers between the perimeter and the house itself. These can be natural or electronic or a combination of the two. Before anyone gets to the house itself, the resident should know where they are, how many there are and what they are doing, so they can get their family to safety.

The horror of the terrorist attacks at two Mumbai hotels has reminded all of us of the pressing need to provide adequate protection for guests at facilities which cater to high-end clientèle, both residents and tourists. These leading hotels in India had what is considered acceptable security in the hospitality industry, yet over 170 people were slaughtered.

guarantee that the attacks in

Mumbai could have been prevented, we can confidently state that the number of victims would have been dramatically diminished had the correct equipment, arrangements, procedures and security personnel training been in place.

The terrorists in Mumbai were easily able to gain entry to hotels, not only to the ground floor, but to every other floor. There is no excuse for this. The worst case scenario should have been that they were able to shoot their way in and then promptly stopped. With more secure entry points, even that could have been made considerably more difficult.

As Sun-Tzu wrote in The Art of War, "Do not depend on the enemy not attacking, but depend on your position that cannot be attacked."

No victim has ever woken up in the morning and thought, "Today is the day someone will break into my house and kill me".

One should never expect to talk their way out of a violent situation or to placate the criminals with whatever is on hand. Anyone who is crazed enough to break into your house is far beyond reasoning, and you are at their mercy.

As is taught in Buddha While no one could ever *Dharma*, "death is certain, the time of death is not".

You first have to send a letter of request to the director of the Department of Corrections by ordinary mail.

The letter must contain the name of the media organization you represent along with contact details including the street address, telephone number, fax number and the name of the person requesting the interview.

The letter should not specify a date for the meeting, but must include the reason why you would like to interview the incarcerated.

If approved by the director of the Corrections Department,

the incarcerated will be asked if she agrees to be interviewed. If the prisoner accepts, the department will inform you when you can interview her.

Talking Planes

Lewis Gibson

"Jumbo" took to the skies, signaling the beginning of a new era in air travel.

The aircraft, two-anda-half times lar-ger than any airliner around at the time, com-

pleted an 85-minute flight, from Pai-ne airfield near Seattle, USA, where Boeing's main plant was – and still is – located.

Planning for the aircraft had begun as far back as 1963, when Boeing decided they needed a new generation of aircraft for the 1970s.

The 747-100 represented a miracle of modern technology that forever changed air travel. Now acknowledged as the world's most recognizable aircraft, the 747 arguably ranks as one of the top five commercial airliners ever produced, along with the BAC-Aerospatiale Concorde, the supersonic Anglo-French thoroughbred, that stopped service for financial reasons in 2003; the McDonnell Douglas DC-3, which revolutionized travel in the 1930s as a reliable, rugged and economic aircraft; the Airbus 380 (more on that in a moment) and the Boeing 707, which was the first aircraft produced in a new classical configuration that set the standard for years to come.

Were those same Phuket visitors to look ahead to the changes in the aviation industry expected over the coming 40 years, what would they see?

A great deal, actually.

First, to set the scene. In the last 20 years air travel has grown by an average of 4.8% each year, despite two major world reces-

sions, acts of terrorism, the 1997 Asian financial crisis, the SARS outbreak in 2003 and two Gulf

It is predicted that the average rate of growth over the next

> passenger travel and 5.8% in cargo. While these predictions will need to be revised in light of the current world recession, it is clear that air travel remains very robust, despite

all that mother nature and mankind can throw at it. Looking ahead, how will the airline industry manage to sustain such growth? The answer lies in new technology.

We are now just over a year into a new generation of aircraft, one that will take air travel to yet another level as we experience new technological advances inside the cabin that will change the flying experience forever – though for some people, not necessarily for the better.

First, there is the new generation aircraft. The Airbus A380 has now been in service with Singapore Airlines – its first customer - for more than a year. Qantas and Emirates have since joined the party, employing the A380 across a variety of routes, and further airlines are set to follow.

One of these is Thai Airways International, which is due to take delivery of six A380s from 2010 onwards.

The A380 is the equivalent of the B747 insofar as it represents a new generation of large, twin-aisle, double-decker aircraft.

The B747, remarkably, is still in use by many airlines around the world. The 1,400th Jumbo was delivered in February, 2008. The A380, however, with a capacity of anything up to 600 seats depending on the configuration, is quieter and has a full double deck, compared with the B747's limited upper deck.

The other significant member of this new generation aircraft is the Boeing 787 "Dreamliner." Already two years behind schedule for entry into commercial service, the B787 is made of light, composite metal and is reputed to be 20% more fuel efficient.

The 210-330 seat B787 is currently expected to enter service in 2010.

Japan and China are also due to introduce their own smaller regional jets. The Japanese Mitsubishi Regional Jet (MRJ-70 and MRJ-90) seats between 70 and 96 passengers, depending on the model, and will also be constructed using composite materials.

The Chinese-manufactured ARJ21 regional jet (70-80 seats) is scheduled for its maiden commercial flight this year. A number of Chinese airlines have already placed orders for the new plane.

The launch of the ARJ21 heralds a new era for Chinese aviation.

And what about the passengers? On-board mobile phone and internet technology is not just around the corner, it is already upon us.

AirAsia, which services Phuket through its subsidiary Thai AirAsia, will become the first Asian carrier to introduce the onboard mobile phone service.

China's Shenzhen Airlines, Kingfisher Airlines of India and Airblue from Pakistan are also due to receive the new on-board mobile phone technology later

this year.


Adoption of internet and email access on aircraft is also gathering pace, with over 50% of airlines surveyed in 2008 planning to embrace both technologies over the next two- to three years. It's a similar story for text messaging, GPRS [Blackberry], laptop messaging and mobile phone calls.

We have clearly come a long way since that historic B747 flight back in 1969 and the future potential for innovation and technological advancement in aviation appear endless. The sky's the limit, you might say.

n an initiative to develop cricket in Phuket, The Phuket Cricket Union, to gether with like-minded volunteers, have launched the Sawasdee Junior League, which, it is hoped, will give local kids the opportunity to get involved in cricket and help drive the development of the game at the grassroots level on the island.

Six school teams from Cherng Talay, Kathu, the BIS, Thai Hua, Sapam and Kajonkiet are taking part in the league, playing an eight-a-side softball version of the sport in games that last one hour. 

Season opening regatta marked by yacht somersault



he opening race of the season at Ao Chalong Yacht Club (ACYC) was marred by extreme weather conditions that saw just six of the 14 boats complete the race and caused one Firefly class yacht to dramatically capsize.

It was ACYC's first race event since its move to new premises earlier this year and the club must have been delighted to see such a strong turnout. There were three Fireflys participating – being granted a class of its own due to their increased numbers – and 11 boats contesting the other three classes – Multihull, Racing and Cruising.

On the day, it was the Fireflys that provided the real drama. *Moto Inzi* narrowly avoided capsizing, following a freak gust of wind and moments

most dangerous way a boat can capsize. It involves the bow burying itself in the wave ahead while the wave behind lifts the stern up and over, causing the boat to flip over at high speed. Two of the crew of four were thrown clear of the boat, while the others were left trapped under the trampoline that joins the twin hulls of the catamaran. One of them, David Hutcheson, later recalled, "A gust came round from Koh Lon, caught us, and the momentum just carried us right over. There were four of us on board and the two at the back were thrown clear but two of us were trapped underneath the trampoline. We were a foot underwater but we were able to swim out." Fortunately, no one was seriously injured and in a show of sailing camaraderie, all the nearby boats retired from their respective races to render assistance to the stricken vessel. David said, "What was fantastic was the way the other boats stopped to help and the support they provided. In particular Bow, the captain of *Seraphin*, who actually swam over to help." Despite the best efforts of

Despite the best efforts of everybody involved, *SEA Properties* remained inverted and had to be towed back to shore. It is now back on dry land – facing the right way up albeit minus a mast. Plans are already afoot to retrieve the mast and everyone involved is optimistic that *SEA Properties* will be back on the water in time to participate in the Top of the Gulf Regatta, to be

held in Pattaya in April.

Of the few boats that finished, Nick Band on *Emerald Blue* won the Racing Class and Richard Simpson on *Dingo* was victorious in the Multihull Class. hen my wife and I moved into the house we live in now, my wife was happy to have a backyard with enough room for a garden, as she enjoys cooking with fresh peppers and herbs. However, a problem soon became apparent. The patio concrete was adjacent to a dirt section.


When it rained, dirt was washed out onto the concrete. I thought that a small retaining wall would preserve the dirt during the rainy season and would also enable me to deepen the garden with a layer of good topsoil. Photo 1 shows only a section, but this little wall is about five meters long, having stood strong now for several years and still doing an exemplary job of keeping the dirt where it belongs.

Just plopping some concrete mix onto the edge of the patio and lining up the bricks would have created a wall, albeit one that would have lasted about one season. To endure, the blocks would have to be securely anchored below the surface, with their faces butting against the edge of the patio concrete (see diagram). The sand, cement and blocks came from a local contractor supply outlet. I used the type of blocks with two lips at each end. For your concrete, mix one part cement and two parts sand together. Add a little water at a time, mixing it in until the concrete is just thick enough that a trowel full takes a moment to drop off the edge when tilted. Mix small batches; just enough for a few

blocks at a time. The soil around my house is fill dirt – which contains a high clay content – so I knew it would compact well.

I pounded a shallow slittrench using a sledgehammer and a two-foot piece of 4"x 4" lumber, holding the lumber upright like a giant nail and pounding on the top until it had compacted the soil down into a square hole. I then lifted it out, moved it along and repeated until I had a long trench about five inches deep and four

inches wide all along the patio's edge. I used a small block of wood on the trench's floor, akin to a movable dam, so that I could pour about two inches of concrete covering about one meter of the trench at a time and not have it flow away when I positioned the blocks. I also applied concrete, like glue, to each block's face

where it would contact the patio's edge. Each block was installed, worked slightly back and forth to settle it into the concrete and tapped into the final position with another piece of lumber. Concrete was poured down each vertical tube-like space where the blocks' lips met, then tamped down with a piece of bamboo. This would really help hold the blocks together.

After all the blocks were installed, I used a smaller batch of just cement (no sand mixed in) as 'caulking', filling in the small gaps between blocks, and formed a sloping surface from the patio to each block (photo 2).


This makes it easier to sweep clean, as dirt accumulates in corners and holds moisture, eventually rotting the concrete. This wall is in my backyard, and no one sees it except my wife and I, so I didn't worry about finishing it too finely.

Important Tips

- 1. For jobs like this, where you're assembling blocks by hand, always mix your concrete in small batches, (about a halfbucketful at a time) or it will harden before you use it all.
- 2. When joining blocks to already hardened concrete, the surfaces must be clean and wet. Dirt blocks the newly-poured concrete from the actual surface; water helps the lime in the cement to chemically adhere to the block or concrete.

I used a plastic garden watering can to wet each block before using it. I also cleaned the dirty edge of the patio by trickling water over it into the trench, using an old sponge to swab it, then trickling more water over it. I let the trench drain overnight, as too much water in the bottom would dilute the concrete when poured in. The watering can also enabled me to wet the edge of the patio as I moved along, without re-flooding the trench.

3. The lime in cement can irritate your skin badly. Wear rubber gloves when working with concrete. If not, wash your hands thoroughly as soon as you finish, then steal some of your wife's hand lotion, and lather it in. That's it! Have a beer! See you next time!





Ants in your pants



was watching a technicolor sunset golden light and ochrous cloud above the dark silhouette of the Nakkerd hills. Momentarily, I was distracted by a winged shape, which flitted past within

touching distance.

Clearly a bat, most likely a pipistrelle. They often congregate overhead in the gathering dusk. Strange though, for despite the old wives' tales of bats entangled in long hair, they normally shun human contact like the plague. Then the creature flew erratically by for a second time, and the penny dropped: this was no bat, but a moth, a gigantic atlas moth. You know, the kind that often ends up as the centerpiece in those glass-fronted, display cases of creepy-crawlies. The sunset was forgotten.

I knew a bit about atlas moths [attacus atlas]. Weeks before, I had been visiting a friend whose front garden boasted a mature sandol [sandoricum] tree. The sandol is grown in Thailand for its refreshing fruits, which are often made into a kind of jam "Go and have a look at that tree," he said. "You will see something interesting." So I went to see. The sandol tree was playing host to a colony of atlas moths in various stages of metamorphosis. Some adults conjoined together had, my friend assured me, been mating for days, others were resting with wings outspread. There were silken cocoons hanging from the foliage, even a few grayish caterpillars.

The atlas moth is an impressive and beautiful creature with chestnut-colored wings, ten inches or more across – probably



the largest span of any insect. Named, some surmise, after the distinctive, map-like patterning of its wings, I prefer to think it is a title that refers to its size.

But unlike Atlas, who supported the heavens on his shoulders, the atlas moth is a delicate creature with wings seemingly too massive for its relatively small body. Its only form of defence resides in those bold markings which may help to deter wouldbe predators. Moreover, it has rudimentary mouth parts, and so does not feed during its brief sojourn in the sun. The cocoons can be used to make silk, but they are not farmed commercially: in south-east Asia, that role is reserved for the silkmoth. At least the atlas moth should be safe in its Nai Harn haven...

Not all insects in Phuket are as decorative and as harmless. Take ants. Thailand is home to literally thousands of species. Some are tiny enough to infiltrate the tightest of food containers; others are large enough to inflict a nasty sting or bite. The termite – bploo uk in Thai, and not strictly speaking an ant at all – is the most notorious.

We have all heard apocryphal stories of 'farangs' returning home after a long absence, only to discover that their prized dining table and chairs have collapsed in a pile of sawdust. I guess humans get their own back somehow, since termites are the second most eaten insect in the world with, so I am informed, a peanutty taste when fried.

While Thailand has no leafcutter ants – their habitats are in America – the kingdom has several tree-dwelling species that possess equally advanced patterns of behaviour. Last week I was watering a garden border. Next to the enclosing wall was an overhang of branches from the jungle beyond, a dense thicket of creeper-clad trees.

Suddenly my nostrils were assailed by a pungent stench, an acidic reek that revived memories of the school chemistry lab. Looking up, I realised I had disturbed several colonies of weaver ants. These insects [oecophylla] are so called because the adult ants encourage the larvae to spin threads from their bodies and use these silken strands to weave leaves together. The result is a nest the size of a football.

It all sounds harmless enough. But now the red troops were massing, moving menac-

ingly along the branches, preparing to repel invaders. The odor of formic acid was stronger than ever. Not a fan of ants in any shape or form, I made the mistake of slashing at the nest with a long-handled machete. Within seconds, ants were dropping like rain from the sky and biting me everywhere – and I mean everywhere! Weaver ants do not sting: instead they dig their mandibles into exposed flesh, lock them in place and squirt formic acid into

the bite. Very painful.


A culinary footnote. Weaver ant larvae are considered a great delicacy, especially in Northern Thailand – a kind of insect caviar. Go to any open-air market in Phuket and you will see appetizing heaps of these grubs, ready to be transformed into an Isaan salad known as *yum khai mod daeng*.[see photo] No wonder the little critters are expensive. Not for me though – fried or *al dente*. Not at any price.

Buyers benefit from changes to condo laws

his past year has seen major revisions to the laws governing condominiums in Thailand – with important ramifications for prospective purchasers. The highly anticipated Condominium Act, B.E. 2522 – effective since July, 2008 – has been a boon for buyers of condominiums, providing consumer protections hitherto unseen in the Kingdom.

Gone are the days when an unscrupulous condominium developer could lure prospective buyers with the wanton dissemination of misleading sales brochures and pictures.

Under the new laws, all promotional and advertising material used by a developer as part of its sales practice shall be deemed to be part of the signed sales contract, and the representations made in such paraphernalia must not misrepresent the premises being sold. Should the developer fail to deliver as advertised, he may now be liable for damages in a court of law.

Condominium sales contracts have now been standardized in a buyer-friendly format. This has brought an end to the practice of some developers incorporating unfairly onerous terms and conditions into their sales contracts. In the past, buyers ran the risk of being duped by unprincipled developers into entering into purchase agreements that compromised their interests. Under the new laws, standardized sales and purchase con-

friendly provisions that provide a significant measure of consumer protection. Now, any provision made in a condominium sales agreement that is not in compliance with the new standardized requirements and which places the buyer at a disadvantage, shall be considered null and void.

Among the principal con-

new standardized contract are provisions relating to termination of contract by the seller, due to a breach of contract by the buyer. In the past, it has been the practice of some developers to include unconscionable termination and forfeiture provisions in the event that a buyer defaulted on his contractual payment obligations. Typically, these provisions allowed for the termination of the contract if the buyer missed a payment for any reason. This would result in the forfeiture of all payments made by the buyer to the developer up to that date.

Such draconian forfeiture provisions, which are tantamount to confiscation clauses, are no longer permitted under the new law. Under the new standardized contracts, a buyer's liability may not exceed 10% of the contract purchase price. Additionally, the law threatens civil and criminal penalties against developers who fall foul of the new laws.

Other notable changes to the law include a provision that accords the purchaser of a condominium the right to assign his contract to a third party without penalty. The new law will also

require the developer and buyer to split the registration cost of the condominium unit.
