British man killed in Andaman pirate attack

SATUN: Three Burmese men were arrested by police on Tuesday, March 24 in Satun province for suspected piracy and the alleged murder of a British man on board a private yacht when it was anchored off a remote island about 75km southwest of the mainland.

On the night of Monday, March 23, British couple Malcolm Stuart Robertson, 64, and his wife Mrs Linda Anne Robertson, 60, were resting below deck in separate compartments of their £3-million, 13.32-meter yacht *Mr Bean*, which was anchored off Dong Island in Satun Province, when they were attacked by pirates, La-Ngu Ampur Police Sergeant, Captain Suppaluk Chatayaporn, told the Gazette.

Mr Robertson is believed to have been killed in the attack and his body thrown overboard. Mrs Robertson was rescued by Satun Police and National Park rangers the following day when they discovered the couple's yacht Immigration records, the couple

floating about 2km north of Khao Yai Island, Satun Province.

Mrs Robertson is said to have suffered minor injuries after being beaten and tied to the mast of the yacht by the pirates and was taken to La-Ngu Hospital. The semi-retired couple were seasoned sailors and had sailed in the region at least once before. This time, they were sailing to Malaysia after leaving Phuket earlier this month.

According to Phuket City

registered their arrival in Phuket on January 12 and then left the province on March 9. It is not known whether they stayed on their boat or in rented accommodation during their stay in Phuket. However, the couple had stayed at Royal Phuket Marina on a previous visit in 2007.

After leaving Phuket, the couple headed for Phi Phi island and were making their way to Lankawi, Malaysia, where they planned to leave their yacht and

Mr Paiboon, who has held the office for almost a year, denied any wrongdoing.

He said that he had always carried out his duties as PPAO president in a fair and transparent manner. "If I had bought

Canadian condo owner claims false arrest

PHUKET CITY: A Canadian man who has lived in Phuket for over a decade has been arrested for working illegally in Thailand, a charge he claims stems from a dispute over maintenance fees with one of the co-owners of a condominium complex in which he owns five units.

Phuket Immigration Police, led by Investigations Inspector Suparerk Pankosol, on March 24 arrested 49-year-old Canadian national James "Jimmy" Nixon.

Mr Nixon was earlier this month asked by Immigration officials to present himself for questioning on March 23.

After questioning by Immi-

gration and Labor Department officials, he was escorted by Immigration police to Tah Chat Chai Police Station, where he was formally charged at around 1pm.

Mr Nixon, from Toronto, was detained in a cell for about three hours while his lawyer and police disputed the validity of the condominium Chanote title deed he had brought with him to post police bail. The document was eventually accepted and Mr Nixon was released around 9pm.

Speaking to the Gazette from inside his jail cell, Mr Nixon explained that he started spending winters in Thailand about 20

Continued from page 1 votes, I would have to get my investment back," he said.

He will be allowed to continue in his duties as normal until the Appeals Court makes its ruling on the case.

"I'm a little disappointed with the EC, but I'm confident that the judicial process will give me justice," he said.

In addition, the commission reached a majority decision to press for criminal charges against Mr Thawee Phanthip, Mr Somsak Torthip, Mrs Lamai Maiso and Miss Siriwan Santisukthirakul for distributing cash to eligible voters.

All four are understood to be canvassers based in tambon Pa Khlok.

The EC ruling did not specify the date of the by-election, which is to be organized by Phuket Election Committee Director Supap Akkam.

Despite the ruling's appearance on the EC website, Mr Supap told the *Gazette* on March 23 that he had yet to receive any official confirmation of the ruling or instructions from the EC, though he said he had received numerous phone calls from reporters about it.

The EC will now forward its findings to the Court of Appeals to render a final decision in the case in accordance with Section 239 of the Constitution.

Former PPAO President Anchalee Vanich Tephabutra, who lost to Mr Paiboon by more than 20,000 votes in the April 2008 contest, told the *Gazette* she has no intention of running in the by-election because she is currently serving in the national government as deputy secretary to Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva.

However, Mrs Anchalee said that she was reviewing EC law to see if there were any statutes that would require her to run for the seat again.

Mrs Robertson told police that on the night of the attack, she and her husband were sleeping in separate compartments down below when she heard a commotion on deck.

There are conflicting reports in British and local media as to whether Mrs Robertson was discovered by the pirates below deck or whether she came up on her own accord. The *Gazette* has been unable to contact Mrs Robertson directly to hear her version of the events.

According to police, Mrs Robertson said she was set upon by the pirates and tied to the yacht's mast. The pirates then sailed the yacht towards the mainland

On Tuesday March 24, fishermen in the Tarutao Marine National Park area, about 60km from Satun mainland, noticed the *Mr Bean* and suspected something strange was happening aboard the yacht. They reported what they saw to Tarutao National Park rangers, who alerted Satun Police. The rangers and police approached the yacht about 2km north of Khao Yai Island at about 10.30am. At that point, the pirates fled in an inflatable dingy belonging to the yacht.

Police chased down and intercepted the inflatable and arrested the three Burmese nationals in it. Police also discovered in the pirates' possession a bag, binoculars, a large knife, a hammer and two laptops belonging to the British couple.

The three Burmese arrested claimed to be fishermen who had been working on a trawler named *Vichai* 6. The suspects have been named by police as Mr Ao, 19, Mr Go, 20, and Mr X, 18, who was born and lived on Phi Phi Island, and is the only one of the suspects who has been able to converse with investigators, as he speaks Thai and English, said Captain Suppaluk.

Captain Suppaluk said that Mr X admitted to killing Mr Robertson with the hammer found in the inflatable. However, Mr X claims that the trio did not intend to kill Mr Robertson, only that they wanted to steal the inflatable dingy so they could get to the mainland.

Mr X told police that the three of them had previously escaped from harsh and abusive conditions on board *Vichai* 6 and that they had been hiding out on

Koh Dong but had run out of food. When they spotted Mr and Mrs Robertson's yacht anchored near the island, Mr X said they swam out to the yacht with the intention of stealing the inflatable, when they saw that the lights on board had been dimmed.

When the suspects were brought ashore at Pakbara Pier in Satun Province, a crowd of locals attempted to assault the suspects. They were reportedly angry at the negative impact on tourism as a result of media coverage of the attacks.

At the time of this edition going to print, the search for Mr Robertson's body was still underway. However, efforts were hampered by bad weather.

Mrs Robertson was said to be recovering in La-Ngu Hospital and the couple's relatives were on their way to Thailand from the UK to be with Mrs Robertson.

Man arrested for money-lender murder

TUNG TONG: Tung Tong Police have arrested a man suspected of the fatal stabbing of a 62-year-old moneylender almost two years ago.

Manop Khobwet, 33, was drinking with friends at his house in tambon Maifard in Trang province when police arrived and took him into custody at around 6pm on March 23.

Kajorn "Ko Jorn" Somnam died in his home in May 2007 after being stabbed twice, once in the neck and once in the torso.

A statement released to the press by Tung Tong Police said that Mr Manop told them he had worked for Mr Kajorn as a rubber cutter.

It said that Mr Manop confessed to carrying out the killing in a fit of jealous rage, after he found his wife at Mr Kajorn's house, wearing nothing but a towel.

Mr Manop also confessed to trying to steal a land title deed he had used as collateral to secure a loan from Mr Kajorn, according to the statement.

Mr Kajorn's fourth son told the *Gazette* he believed the murder was about the money Mr Manop owed to his father and not about jealousy.

"I don't believe a love triangle was the motive.Instead I believe he killed my dad because he wanted to get the title deed back to clear his debt," he said.

He told the Gazette that he


was not working in Phuket, but had merely been elected by fellow condo owners as their 'juristic person' representative at an annual meeting. Serving as a condo owners' representative is an unpaid position and does not constitute work, he maintains.


"I just serve as a safety net to protect the common interests of all the co-owners in our condo estate," he said. There are many foreigners on the island in similar positions, and to his knowledge none have ever been accused of working here illegally for this reason, he said. There are often cases in which 'aliens' are arrested in Thailand for doing work which would not be considered illegal for foreigners without work permits in other countries.


Mr Nixon concedes that Thai labor law as it applies to foreigners is vague about what actually constitutes 'work', but he feels the authorities are selectively enforcing the law in his case at the behest of one of the condo co-owners, who is in arrears on his maintenance fees. Phuket Immigration admit to arresting Mr Nixon, but told the *Gazette* they could not give more details about the case until Lt Col Suparerk returns from a seminar in Bangkok. Today, Mr Nixon spent all morning in a holding room at Phuket Provincial Court. He was finally allowed to leave the court at about 5pm, after he was formally charged for working without a work permit and his lawyer posted court bail.

"Does the local government really want to ask us to keep investing in properties and not allow us to sit on management committees? There is something strange about this," he said.

"If Thai authorities don't want foreign investors, they should just tell us clearly, as opposed to arresting us," he added.







Brit gets almost 20 years for ATM scam

PHUKET CITY: Despite confessing to the charges against him, a British man has been sentenced to 18 years and 9 months in prison for ATM fraud.

Mark Hubert Veerasawmy, 45, received the sentence at Phuket Provincial Court several weeks ago, British Honorary Consul Martin Carpenter said.

Mr Veerasawmy was arrested in February last year together with his son Sonny, aged 20 years old.

Phuket City Police arrested the pair after receiving a report that two men were acting suspiciously in front of the Kasikornbank branch on Chanacharoen Road, near the Robinson department store.

When the police came to investigate, they found the pair in possession of 15 ATM withdrawal slips, 10,000 baht in cash and 35 fake ATM cards, Capt Supachai nies the charges against him.

New governor unveils plans for Phuket

PHUKET CITY: New Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop presented his plans for Phuket to more than 200 government officers at the Royal Phuket City Hotel on Wednesday March 18.

As Phuket is a tourist destination and a gateway to Thailand, Gov Wichai said he will focus on solving problems related to land, traffic, flooding, entertainment venues, business and drugs.

"Phuket's environment needs to be improved, and we need to stop the destruction of natural resources by construction projects for resorts, hotels and industry. Also the problem of public land encroachment should be solved. I will talk with local leaders about the licensing of resort and hotel construction," he said.

"Besides that, I plan to beautify the route from Phuket International Airport to Phuket City. We'll clean it up and plant more trees, generating lots of benefits without great expenditure," he added.

Gov Wichai also addressed the flooding of Thepkrasattri Road in front of the Boat Lagoon in Koh Kaew, saying he would speak to local leaders to try and find a solution to the chronic prob-

Fixing the lack of water in Kamala, Srisoonthorn and other drought-stricken areas is also on his agenda.


The problem of traffic congestion in Phuket should also be taken seriously, he said.

Gov Wichai singled out the route from Sarasin Bridge to the Tah Chat Chai checkpoint, as well as the Heroines Monument, Tesco-Lotus and Darasamuth School intersections as particularly problematic. One solution might be to ban trucks from certain areas during rush hour, he

Thick concrete barriers will be placed alongside some roads to prevent vehicles from hitting electricity poles, though he did not specify where or when this would happen.

Entertainment venues such as bars, pubs and clubs should follow regulations strictly, he said.

jor problem, he suggested introducing sniffer dogs at the Tah Chat Chai checkpoint and other key locations in order to intercept narcotic shipments.


Gov Wichai said he intends to talk to the relevant authorities about the longstanding issue of foreign tour companies that don't employ Thai staff.

"Some tours bring their own guides and staff to the island while staying and traveling here. It means we lose benefits that should rightfully be ours," he said.

Gov Wichai pledged to continue pursuing initiatives of former governor Preecha Ruangjan, including any projects under Royal Patronage and the decades-old dream of building an international conference center on the island.



n a "Khunying" private charter from Cape Panwa to Phang Nga Bay, we came across a two-kilometer wide rubbish slick – one so thick you could walk on it. Caught between Ao Makham, Koh Sireh and the Phi-Phi speedboat route, the amount of floating rubbish was shocking.

Certainly not as bad as the three 'Great Mid-Pacific Rubbish Slicks' that run from halfway between California and Hawaii almost reaching Japan, Phuket's own 'open sewer in the sea' is far more preventable. Educate the

Clean up the bay

Phuket ports' fishermen and the tourism trade, and we could eliminate Phuket's devastating and embarrassing open cesspool.

I promised my high profile guests I would write about it, but I also questioned whether this effort would do any good. I've walked the coastlines and paddled the waters of Puerto Princesa since 1995 without ever finding even one small piece of rubbish; but Phuket just doesn't seem to grasp this issue.

When a pygmy sperm whale beached and died on a Phuket beach, Dr Sonthaya of the Phuket Marine Biology Center dissected the victim, only to find its stomach was a mass of marine rubbish, including 25 black plastic rubbish bags. This whale had the strength to make it to shore. Most don't. It's a given that all South Thailand's cetaceans – plus many more forms of sea life – are swimming the seas with plenty of man-made 'excess baggage' in their guts.

I paddle the waters of Phang Nga Bay about three days a week. I can't just pass floating rubbish, and always pick-up one I can't just pass floating rubbish, and always pick-up one or two black plastic rubbish bags.

or two black plastic rubbish bags. Over 20 years, the conservative estimate is about 8,000 bags. It's getting old.

Tarutao is even worse. Sitting at the mouth of the Straits of Malacca, the heavily trafficked international shipping lane is an

open sewer. While Thai rubbish is a contributor, international marine rubbish is overwhelming. Poor Tarutao doesn't stand a chance. Every November, the National Park cleans its beaches with heavy equipment. Within a month, it's back to normal.

All this is preventable with awareness, so I invited my Prince of Songkla students to help me clean the Bay on my 64th birthday. I don't care about birthdays, but the date does point out that I'm not getting any younger, and one day, I won't be pulling rubbish out of Thailand's most beautiful natural spot. The Park was a bit nervous about the clean-up, but we embraced them in a spirit of 'helpfulness' and the Park joined in with the program - besides, how could they turn away 84 students cleaning their own country?

Although the Park's official website claims around 48,000 visitors a year, a survey by Thailand's major tour operators puts the figure somewhere between three and five million. Who knows for certain? One thing is for sure; there are definitely more

visitors than the meager Park staff can handle, so we decided to give them a hand with a smile and spirit of cooperation.

More importantly, we wanted to create an atmosphere of awareness about this serious problem, if only to give Dr Sonthaya some rest. I had expected just my class of 16 students on a one-day effort, but thanks to Dr Rick Kramer's enthusiasm, the number swelled to 84 over a five-day schedule. Complete with TV, radio, print media, and other travel industry professionals, we took 20-25 rubbish collectors each day. The media was vital. They spread the message to the masses. Thanks guys!

High winds prevented collecting floating rubbish. For safety reasons I kept participants in the lee of islands, and we cleaned up beaches. Even with this limitation, we still collected 74 bags of rubbish – a mere drop in the bucket. Media was crucial to the effort, creating awareness of the marine rubbish problem and other forms of man-made pollution with the emphasis on switch-



ing from 2-stroke to 4-stroke outboards engines. Our eventual goal was to develop larger wide-ranging clean-up festivals that enlist every government department, school, scouts and youth program in the Phuket-Phang Nga-Krabi triangle. Clean-up and educate in the morning, then party in the afternoon. If we want the masses to participate, it has to be fun.

Critics may say it's a lofty and grandiose ambition, but that's exactly what happens in my case study in the Philippines, detailed in my environmental activist video, *Taking Back Your Own Environment: The Puerto Princesa Model*. If a Filipino town of 200,000 can become 100% rubbish and crime free, we can certainly employ our far greater resources to do even better. All it takes is commitment. I challenge government officials to answer the call.

Our first stop was the lee directly across from James Bond Island. I expected picnic rubbish on the small sandy beach. What we discovered was a years-old impromptu rubbish dump. We barely scratched the surface because the stratified layers of broken glass bottles were simply to dangerous to risk a complete clean-up.

Even so, in an hour we collected 24 bags of rubbish without making a dent. Excuse me for assuming the James Bond rubbish could go back to the mainland by boat, especially thousands of broken beer bottles. National Park boats on their way back to Park Headquarters can haul out rubbish at no extra cost - it's not rocket science. We train guides from the villages around the Bay so they can get jobs working on their own islands, the same as Phuket-based guides. These guys are still 'diamonds in the rough' but they got it right away.

On day two, they validated the concept by suggesting a beach near their village that's carpeted in styrofoam and plastic. When the Rangers showed

up, they were shocked. Khun Jai took plenty of pictures, and his staff were surprised by the mess.

Jai is always telling us he's spread too thin to implement my many suggestions. We understand their under-staffing problem, so we hope to have an even bigger clean-up to start the high season – a great promotion for a clean, environmental Phuket.

We can't ask the understaffed Park to do it all on their own, and marine rubbish knows no boundaries. I see rubbish in the depths of caves and crevasses so deep and narrow I cannot proceed. The plastic bags from

James Bond Island and water containers from tour boats don't stop at Park boundaries, so all the islands in the Bay are trashed.

We are light years away from the perfection of well organized, corruption-free Puerto Princesa, but so is draconian Singapore. We must use Princesa as our standard and not rest until marine life is protected from marine rubbish. And the same goes for our tourism industry. If we want high-quality tourists to return, we must clean up our house.

In on-board surveys 95% of my guests say they book us because of our environmental com-

mitment. The same folks talk of their disdain for tour companies that make bogus environmental claims. Just saying "Keep the Bay clean" without any actual substance is counterproductive – and I'm so tired of picking up plastic water bottles bearing the logos of companies that make these claims, I might start dumping them at the Phuket Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) office. For decades, the TAT has claimed its role is only one of promotion, and for decades, critics have complained that the TAT must also manage the consequences of its promotional power.

An effective yet inexpensive TAT public education program could solve 75% of the problem. Multi-lingual signage, such as the humorous cartoons we produced at a cost of 3,000 baht each (total cost of 36,000 baht), show tourists how to behave in the Park – not only stopping marine rubbish but being quiet in the caves and hongs, and not feeding the monkeys. We produced them not only for our own guests - most speak English anyway – but to donate to other tour companies, and for the National Park to place at every Phang Nga bay entry point.

The new wave of environmentally destructive group tours are not Chinese, but Russian – they have no more sense of environment than the Chinese group tours that trashed Phuket in years past. It isn't their fault – Russia has no history of environmental awareness. Just ask their former satellite states about the destruction that surfaced once the Russians pulled out of Eastern Europe. Whatever the nationality, all that counts is learning the message

A Phang Nga Bay clean-up highlights the fact that citizens of the planet must all take responsibility for our own home, rather than expect others to do it for us – even when those programs are funded with our taxes. Action really starts with not dropping rubbish in the sea.

Let's start an annual megaclean up festival, complete with an afternoon festival as a reward. Aside from the waters and coastline of South Thailand, we have about 500 islands and a variety of marine life that needs our help. I challenge our new tourism oriented Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop, the National Parks and the TAT to join with us in cleaning up our most precious resource – our own home.

The Prince of Songkla students certainly got the message. Now we have to take it to the masses.



Ministry calls for action against young addicts

BANGKOK: The age of youths at risk of *ya bah* (methamphetamine) addiction dropped to as low as 10 years old, due mainly to a failure in control measures that has made drugs more cheaply available, the Public Health Ministry revealed recently.

Medical Services deputy chief Dr Boonreun Triruen-worarat said that *ya bah*, a mixture of methamphetamine and caffeine in tablet form was the drug of choice among youths.

Dr Boonreun blamed the failure on a lack of strict controls and lax punishments for drug dealers as the main cause of the widespread usage and the rising number of new, younger addicts.

The situation was getting worse and more people were getting addicted, especially women and teenagers, because the narcotics were now available online at a cheap price, he said.

Citing past records that showed the age of addicts as being between 18 and 24, he said addicts nowadays were between

Gasohol and cancer linked

BANGKOK: The Environmental Research and Training Center (ERTC) expressed concern on March 20 that gasohol might have been pushing up the level of carbonyl compounds along busy roads. The compounds, which include formaldehyde and acetaldehyde, are known to increase cancer risk. The Thai government has promoted the use of gasohol since 2006, making its selling price significantly lower than diesel oil and benzene. Citing research conducted along 49 roads in Bangkok between 2006 and 2008, researcher Daisy Morknoy said levels of formaldehyde and acetaldehyde on some roads have been much higher than the safe level prescribed by the US Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment.

Orapin Wongchumpit, director of the Department of Environmental Quality Promotion, said her office would recheck the the initial findings and conduct a study in collaboration with the Pollution Control Department.

More housing for the poor needed: seminar

BANGKOK: Greedy real estate developers and a muddled government is leaving poor families out in the cold, say experts.

The economic downturn has resulted in a 50% drop in home sales in Thailand compared to the peak volume before the 1997 crisis, a recent Bangkok housing seminar was told.

Somchao Tantherdtha, chairman of the Thai Real Estate Association, said the drop was mainly due to tighter loan policies by banks, and home buyers being unable to meet installment payments.

Clear and consistent government policies on housing are vital for economic growth and employment, he told the seminar of more than 300 real estate developers, government officials and academics from around the world.

Professor Pree Buranasiri, a former National Housing Association (NHA) governor, said government support and soft loans were needed so that low-income earners could buy homes more easily.

He attacked the government's lack of coordination, saying there were 28 departments under 14 ministries and six independent organizations involved in working out the national housing policy.

Mr Pree said that the average size of a Thai home was 32 square meters, dropping to just eight sqm in the case of a low-income family of four.

Somchai Jitsuchon of the Thailand Development Research Institute said that the widening income gap meant more homes for low-income earners were needed as more people migrated to Bangkok to seek work.

He also expressed worries about the mental health of children living in low-cost NHA apartments.

Incumbent NHA governor Suchart Siriyophan brought some good news, telling the seminar that 120,000 homes would be built next year if a 30 billion baht budget is approved.

Dutch analyst Cor Dijkgraaf drew parallels between the US subprime crisis and the collapse of the Thai economy in 1997.

Over-investment in real estate was a big factor in both crises. Developers sank their money into niche-market housing while ignoring low-income earners, he said.





Vegetable vendor shot by loan sharks

SURAT THANI: A vegetable seller and her son were seriously injured after being shot in their Muang District home on March 19. Police believe the shooting was connected to a debt that one of the victims owed to a loan shark.

Nantha Wongkul, 52, and her son Natthaphon Wongkul, 35, were shot in the head with a .38 caliber pistol.

Volunteer rescue workers took them to Surat Thani Hospital, where at last report they remained in serious condition.

Mrs Nantha's daughter and grandchild were also at home at the time of the shooting.

They told police that just after 11pm, two men jumped over the fence and ran into the house. One of the men then shot Mr Natthaphon two or three times.

When Mrs Nantha stood up to go to her son, the gunmen shot her as well.

Mrs Nantha's daughter identified the gunmen as loan sharks whom she knew only as "Keng" and "Sae".

Her mother had borrowed 10,000 baht from the men to fund her business selling vegetables, but had been struggling to make repayments due to the poor state of the economy, she told police.

On the day of the incident, Keng and Sae had come to the house to collect the 200 baht daily payment, but Mrs Nantha did not have the money.

Saying that that they are quite sure the debt was the motive for the shooting, police said they are now hunting for the loan sharks.

Family of murdered Imam calls for compensation

NARATHIWAT: Lawyers representing family members of an Imam who was beaten to death while in Army custody last year filed a civil suit against the Ministry of Defence on March 19, demanding 10 million baht in compensation.

After an inquest, a Narathiwat court last December ruled that 56-year-old Yapa Koseng was tortured and killed by soldiers while being interrogated at an Army base in March last year.

The Cross Cultural Foundation, a leading Thai human rights organization working in the Deep South, expressed hope that the civil law suit against the Ministry would serve as a deterrent for future abuses.

Following the December court ruling, New York-based Human Rights Watch urged the Thai government to indict the soldiers responsible.

No action has yet been taken against individual officers.

Bombs defused in Surat Thani

SURAT THANI: Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva believes the planting of four bombs in Kanchanadit and Muang Districts was politically motivated.

Deputy Inspector Thanan Chuaynoo said that on March 18 police were tipped off that a suspicious bag was hidden behind a cutout campaign picture showing Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva together with former PM Chuan Leekpai, Democrat Party Deputy Chief Adviser Banyat Bantadtan and Deputy Prime Minister Suthep Thaugsuban.

Two PVC pipes filed with powergel dynamite connected to an electric circuit board and a

mobile phone were found in the cloth bag.

A robotic device was used to spray it with high-pressure water and destroy the circuitry.

A second device, comprising two black metal fire-extinguisher cylinders, was found a day earlier next to a high-voltage electricity pole opposite a restaurant on Chanakasem Road, which leads to Surat Thani's Muang District. The road was closed to traffic until the device was retrieved.

A security guard from South Land Rubber first noticed the bombs that morning, but did not realize what they were until after dark, when he saw a blinking light on the cylinders and called the police.

DPM Suthep Thaugsuban said he was told the device, planted near the Democrat Party office in Kanchadit District, was the work of people planning political turmoil. PM Abhisit said they wanted to discredit his government.

Sompol Wichaidit, chairman of Pheu Thai Party's southern branches, refuted these assertions. He said he suspected the bomb plantings resulted from internal fighting in the Democrat Party.

Noting that the bomb makers were well-trained, police said they would keep up their surveillance around the clock.

Songs For Life star dies in motorcycle accident

NAKHON SRI THAMMARAT: A well-known *phleng pheua chiwit* (Songs For Life) singer was killed in a motorcycle accident in Khanom District on March 16.

Around 10am, 40-year-old Decha "De" Chantha-amphon lost control of his Honda Wave motorcycle on a bend in tambon Khanom Village 3, crashing into a roadside berm. He died at the scene.

Police said that Mr Decha was driving from a *khao tom* (rice porridge) restaurant in Bang Phaeng Market to a relative's house when he lost control.

Police believe that he was drunk at the time of the crash.

Mr Decha was the lead singer of the popular Nakhon band. He was well-known among Songs For Life fans in the South as "De Nakhon".

Khanom Police Inspector for Investigations Wachiraphan Keuakaow said that at the time of his death, Mr Decha was under investigation for domestic violence following a claim by his wife that he beat her.

The phleng pheua chiwit

genre of music is a form of folkrock which developed in the 1970s and was originally inspired by left wing political thoughts popular at the time.

The lyrics typically deal with adversities faced by the poor. Fans can often be identified by their distinctive dress style, which often includes a bandana as sported by singer Aed Carabao.

Land encroachers caught

TRANG: Forestry officials in Wang Wiset District on March 19 detained three men for destroying protected forest land.

The men, 38-year-old Samruat Ramsong, 18-year-old Praphan Khumrat and a 17-year-old youth who cannot be named for legal reasons, were handed over to Wang Wiset Police by the forestry officials to be charged. The

officials told police that the men had cleared over six rai in the Pa Sai Pa Kae forest reserve.

Officials confiscated two machetes and a saw from the trio.

The men confessed to clearing the land in order to plant rubber trees. They also admitted to having cleared other patches of national park land in the past.





Fishing ban imposed in gulf Protests block



fishing ban has been imposed in the waters off Prachuap Khiri Khan, Surat Thani and Chumphon provinces. The moratorium, which came into effect in mid February, was issued by the Fish Game Department of Thailand and covers the sea around the islands of Koh Samui, Koh Phangan and Koh Tao.

Department head Somying Piumsombun said that certain methods of fishing were causing damage to marine life.

He said the ban, which is to remain in effect until May 15, should give fish a chance to spawn and reproduce undisturbed. Fishermen in the affected

regions are calling on the government to reverse the order, which they claim is posing a threat to their livelihoods.

The government has responded to the pleas by stating that the ban had been ordered for the good of the fishing industry, as the Gulf of Thailand has been over-fished for many years, resulting in lower fish stocks.

The Fishery Department is particularly concerned with more harmful means of fishing that include bottom trawling. This method is very damaging to the reefs and marine life and the group is looking to have this technique outlawed for another year.

Studies carried out in the

area have suggested that fish stocks could be completely wiped out in the coming decades if procedures are not put in place to arrest the current trend.

If the sea is to recover, marine-protected areas (MPAs) must be established, such as the ones in Koh Similan and Koh Surin. The further tightening of restrictions around the Ang Thong National Marine park and other MPAs is planned.

Violators of the ban risk a fine of between 5,000 and 10,000 baht and/or one year imprisonment. The embargo has provoked strong opposition with many fishing boats still being seen in the waters around the islands.

rotests against Anglo supermarket giant Tesco caused three days of havoc in the port town of Na Thon, Ko Samui. Small business owners and local residents set up a blockade in front of the local district office and the Na Thon branch of the supermarket to protest against more branches being opened around the island.

Koh Samui already has two Tesco stores - one megastore near Chaweng and a smaller 'Express' branch serving Na Thon. A branch has also recently opened on Koh Phangan, while the chain has begun construction on an additional branch in the Lamai area.

Protesters have set out to stop any further plans for expansion of the chain, expressing their concern that it is bad for local businesses and shopkeepers. In February, Surat Thani Governor Pracha Taerat reportedly sent a letter to the managing director of Ek-Chai Distribution System Co Ltd, which operates the Tesco Lotus supermarkets, seeking a halt to the construction of the new branch.

The group has been lobbying since the beginning of last holding a series of protests urging the government to refuse ment official addressed the while construction continues.

group, stating that this issue has been faced by many other provinces around the country that were in a similar position. He urged protesters to try to come to a solution that would benefit the local businesses. A representative from the Consumer Protection Agency told the gathering that if further plans were not stopped, the group would seek to raise the issue at a national level in a bid to stop development on Samui.

The Tesco Lotus group has responded to the group's demands by issuing a statement on their website in which it defends the need for further shops around the island, claiming it provides jobs, generates revenue for the island and is beneficial to tourism. The statement goes on to say that it also offers consumers cheaply priced quality products. Branches of Tesco Lotus currently provides jobs for 500 island residents, the company added, also pointing out that taxes paid to the government exceeded 14 million baht for 2008.

The retail group said that with the opening of the new branch in Lamai, a further 200 jobs would be created and tax revenues of around 10 million baht would be generated. Moreover, the new shop would allow for some 50 local retailers to operate out of the facility.

The Anti-International Hypermarket Association has spearheaded the protests, calling for an immediate ban on the construction or opening of large stores such as Tesco Lotus, Big C and Makro, which all currently operate on the island. Other shops like the popular 7-Eleven chain, which presently has over 50 branches on Koh Samui alone, is also a bone of contention for the group. Following the protests, activists have admitted that the mega corporation is very difficult to go up against legally.



Flavors on the Hill - Onwards, Upwards



Into the Med

ife, many claim, is an imitation of art. There's a pivotal scene in the 2007 movie *Ratatouille* where the much feared, snootynosed restaurant reviewer tastes the rat-chef's signature dish – ratatouille.

As soon as his taste buds are caressed by the ambrosial-like harmony of flavors, he's instantly transported back to his childhood and his mother's version of the dish. Last night I had a similarly sublime experience when I sampled Chef Akorn's renderings at Flavors on the Hill, above Patong.

To carry on the theme of art intertwining with life, the Phuket history of Loi Et-born Chef Akorn and his French wife Cathy reads a bit like a picaresque novel. Starting at The Wall – a colorful, cushion-filled venue in what was then a leafy backwater soi in Rawai (should see it now...) – diners appreciated the fresh-from-the-garden herbs, easy culinary innovation and the friendly service; naturally the place flourished.

Moving near to Kamala, the couple opened the poolside Naka Flavors, that attracted a new clientèle – the faithful duly followed as well.

Then they upped sticks and settled in the grounds of the Banthai Beach Resort on Patong's Beach Road for a while before opening Flavors on the Hill some time ago. By any interpretation, they have enjoyed an eventful few years. Flavors on

the Hill is open sided and overlooks the crest of the Patong-Karon Road. Set back a little, the car park acts as a buffer zone between the restaurant and the buzz of traffic laboring up and swishing down the hill.

The design is predominantly wood-based and as rustic as you can get in upwardly mobile Phuket, where a couple of bags of cement and sliding full-length windows seem to be constructors' answer to any aesthetic challenge. This wooden arrangement suits Akorn right down to the ground – the man is happy here; you can sense it.

Maybe I'm already preaching to the converted, but for those who have not yet sampled his dishes I strongly suggest that you do. The reason being is that this guy is simply amazing in the kitchen and can make a humble spud taste like caviar; just imagine what he can do with fresh market material and a free range in his kitchen. And that's exactly what he does in his Flavors on the Hill outlet. His cooking is... well, adjectives fail me – just go along and sample it.

We kick off with a juicy *foie* gras that contrasts nicely with crisp toast slices and grated car-

rot with salad (290 baht) while Carlos Santana twangs away on the in-house stereo. The evening's musical entertainment had started a bit inauspiciously with boy bands desperately trying to sound sincerely sexy so things immediately fall 'N Sync (groan) once the music is sorted out.

The *foie gras* is followed by a luscious beef fillet with three sauces (480 baht) and a tuna fillet with orange butter and potatoes (320 baht) – both main dishes accompanied by that marvelous, incredible, hallucinatory, juicy and unforgettable *ratatouille* of Akorn. Sipping on an Italian Merlot house red (130 baht a glass), we slip into what can only be described as a culinary state of euphoria which to be honest is a physical impossibility if Boyzone and Back Street Boys

are factored in, but definitely achievable with Santana and Earth Wind and Fire, plus a pretty girl serving drinks.

This is top stuff, make no mistake – the man is a master of his art, the restaurant unpretentious and the atmosphere welcoming.

For an evening out in a rustic setting with top-of-the-range cuisine at reasonable rates, you'll have a long search to beat this place. Top of the hill, indeed, and highly recommended.



Riding a mercurial wave

nlike Bali and the Philippines, Thailand is a part of South East Asia that is not synonymous with surfing and surf culture. When one thinks of water sports in Thailand, it is scuba diving that first springs to mind.

Koh Tao in the Gulf of Thailand and the Similan Islands in the Andaman Sea are Thailand's diving hotspots, attracting thousands of visitors per year. With an abundance of coral reef surrounding Thailand's coastline, you'd be forgiven for thinking that surfing in the Kingdom is practically nonexistent.

A small group of Phuketbased surf enthusiasts are trying to change this perception. In 2002, the Phuket Board Riders Club staged the inaugural Thailand Surf Series, in a bid to expose the sport to a wider audience.

Since its inception, the annual competition has grown in size and stature and has attracted increasing numbers of participants year after year.

On a visit to Phuket to help promote the event, the CEO of Quiksilver SE Asia Paul Hutson and Quiksilver's sports marketer and ex-pro surfer Jake Paterson joined Chanin "Joob" Aiyarak, the president of the Phuket Board Riders Club, to talk to the Gazette about the 2009 Quiksilver Thailand Surf Series.

Gazette: What is the history of the Phuket Board Riders Club?

Joob: The club was formed in 2002 by a small group of surfers who hung out on the beach. We decided that we had to do something to promote surfing in Thailand, to let people know that we have good surf in Phuket.

We started out with just 15 members, but our membership has grown each year. In 2008 we totaled 100 - 60% Thai, 40% expat.

Gazette: Thailand's not known for its surf culture. Why did Quiksilver – a brand synonymous with surfing – decide to get involved in Thailand?

Paul: For core surfers, I think that Thailand has always been on the map as a surf destination. From our point of view, there's great potential here.

From a local surf community point of view, we'd like to assist in the development of surfing in Thailand and promote some of the issues that are important to us as a company, namely keeping the beaches and the water in pristine condition so we as surfers can enjoy them for many years to come.

Gazette: Do you believe that surf tourists from hotspots like Australia and the US are likely to choose Phuket over, say, Bali or the Philippines?

Jake: Its a tough question, and it all depends on what people want from their holidays. Phuket is a great place to holiday with the family and to be given the chance to combine it with some good waves is brilliant.

That's where Phuket will find its market.

Gazette: What are the tangible benefits that will be felt by the local community through Quiksilver's association with the Thailand Surf Series?

Paul: We'd like to get a message across about environmental awareness. It's true we're a business, but it's not just about taking. We're starting with a three-year sponsorship of the series and then as we go forward we'd like to start projects with the schools and the beach community about keeping the beaches clean.

I think it starts with supplying rubbish bins so rubbish doesn't end up in the ocean. It has to start at a young age through the schools and with the help of the local government. We've met with them quite a bit and they're very supportive of our initiative.

Gazette: What are you looking forward to most about working alongside Quiksilver?

Joob: It's a great opportunity for local surfing and we're glad to have Quiksilver on board. It's a big competition and Quiksilver can help us with advertising, supply us with equipment and keep the locals surfing.

Gazette: Finally, what format will the surf series take and how will it help put Phuket on the surfing map?

Jake: Three events, with four categories: long boards, open men's, juniors and women and it's open to everyone.

It's going to be a great time for people to get together, with big wrap up parties, and it will show the world that Phuket has some great waves and lifestyle.

Blair Speers

Blair Speers is probably one of Phuket's most successful entrepreneurs. His HotelTravel.com covers, he says, 95 per cent of the world's destinations.

'We are a pioneer in multilingual online content. We have dozens of native speakers in eight languages working on our site. While Thailand is our largest destination, growth really took off when we went global and began to target Asian Languages," Blair says.

HotelTravel.com currently has over 50,000 hotels in its inventory and adds more by the day. "The site's service and selection makes it one of the world's leading online providers of hospitality," Blair says, adding that, "We have developed a technology that enables our customers to choose from hundreds of wholesalers and tens of thousands of hotels.

"We are in constant contact with our supply chains, advising them to update the inventory on a real time basis. This includes the latest special rates, niche market opportunities, and the best deals on the Internet. Hotels need to look at new distribution channels like HotelTravel.com, and marketing directors need to 'step up their game' in the current economic environment."

Blair's inherited work ethic drives him to make HotelTravel the top online travel agency in the

"I always wanted to have my own business and have it make an impact on a global level," he says.

Such ambition comes from family values instilled while growing up in Edmonton, Canada. Blair received his first computer at age eight, and spent two years programming on a pre-Internet Bulletin Board System. He used his neighbor's computer lab to develop and create applications for data communications.

When not on the computer, Blair became a championship wrestler in Canada in the 48-52 kilogram class. He traveled around the globe and eventually was invited to compete in the world wrestling championships.

During college, he decided to get a degree in education with a focus on athletics. He suddenly realized early in his educational career that he would not be able to reach his ambition on a global level, so in 1994 he flew to Thailand to visit a relative in Phuket and discover his life's calling.

Blair spent the next four years running his own English language schools, primarily for the expatriate Korean community. He worked seven days a week at his popular House of Harmonious Learning school, which became a feeder school for what is now the British International School.

By late 1998, he was back at his computer creating programs for a local online hotel booking company. Then a local entrepreneur, Stephen Baxter, offered to set Blair up with a group of investors who could fund his own online start-up.

"Stephen is my mentor. After I pitched my ideas to his investor, they showed a lot of interest. I had other offers but decided to self fund HotelTravel.com in partnership with Stephen.

HotelTravel received its first bookings in mid-2000 and over the next two years worked primarily with wholesalers in Asia. At the end of 2002, its bookings surged after tapping into the Japanese market using their native language. By 2006, the company had a global presence selling hotel rooms in every major destination in the world in eight key languages: Chinese, Korean, Japanese, French, German, Italian, Spanish and English.

"There's an enormous, ongoing learning curve to harness new technology that can adapt to new market conditions. Holiday behavior is very much affected by the global economy. We can see the trends very quickly by both geographic region and by language. We are currently incorporated in 11 countries, managing almost 300 staff with a rapidly expanding site of over 500,000 web pages," Blair concluded.

Vote Earth with your light switch



ore than one billion people around the globe will be turning off their lights for an hour this Saturday in support of the World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) and its global initiative to tackle climate change. The Earth Hour 2009 campaign will unite people in 1,000 cities around the world through an hour of darkness in what is being hailed as the largest climate event in history.

The organizers are calling this year's Earth Hour the world's first global election between Earth and global warming with people of all ages, nationalities, race and background voting with their light switches. "Switching off our lights is a vote for Earth, leaving them on is a vote for global warming."

The WWF say this is the chance for the people of the world to make their voice heard and is urging the world to "Vote Earth" and reach the target of 1 billion votes. Those votes will be presented to world leaders at the Global Climate Change Conference in Copenhagen 2009, which has been organized to determine

official government policies to take action against global warming and will replace the Kyoto Protocol which has been in place since 1997.

Earth Hour began in Sydney in 2007 when 2.2 million homes and businesses switched off their lights for one hour. By 2008, the message had grown into a global sustainability movement, with 50

million people switching off their lights. Global landmarks such as the Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco, Rome's Colosseum, the Sydney Opera House and the Coca Cola billboard in Times Square all stood in darkness for Earth Hour last year.

Over 74 countries and territories have pledged to 'vote Earth' during Earth Hour 2009 by

simply switching off lights for one hour on Saturday, March 28, from 8.30 to 9.30pm local time.

A number of resorts in Phuket have pledged to add their Earth votes on Saturday.

The 470-room Le Méridien Phuket Beach Resort will be shutting down non-essential lighting in its buildings and unoccupied guest rooms while encouraging guests to switch off non-essential lights in their rooms.

Guests dining at its restaurants on that evening will also be requested to enjoy their dinner by candlelight.

All Six Senses-branded properties and spas worldwide will be turning off their lights. In Phuket, Six Senses guests can join group meditation classes, educational discussions or enjoy spa treatments in the soft glow of locally produced candles.

The Sheraton Grande Laguna Phuket will be turning off exterior signage lighting, dimming or turning off non-essential interior lighting, using candlelight in appropriate public areas, such as restaurants and bars and will be staging an Energy Saving Cocktail event lit up by candlelight and burning torches at poolside. Guests will also be encouraged to support Earth Hour with other energy-saving measures for one full hour further. Ten ways for businesses to support **Earth Hour**

- 1. Hold a contest among employees with a prize for the best ideas for reducing waste and cutting energy consumption in daily operations.
- 2. Ask your business partners, suppliers and industry peers to support Earth Hour. Hang banners and posters so that your support is visible.
- 3. Turn your website "black" during the week leading up to Earth Hour; make all white backgrounds black and all black text white. (Google did this in 2008). Make a link to the Earth Hour home page.
- 4. Hold a company-wide event or celebration for employees the week proceeding Earth Hour and serve "green-themed" refreshments. Host an Earth Hour "lights out" party for your staff, customers and vendors on the night of the event. Be sure to turn out at 8:30 pm local time.
- 5. Schedule a meeting or send an email to employees explaining why the company is supporting Earth Hour and urge them to "turn out" at home.
- 6. Create an Earth Hour section on the company intranet where employees can post ideas for celebrating Earth Hour and photos following up the event.
- 7. Hold employee contests with awards going to the staff member who recruits the most people to sign a pledge to say they will participate or who comes up with the most creative promotional idea for Earth Hour.

elcome to the fifth in a series of Tai Chi Timeouts. Each timeout takes you through a single, easy-to-follow Tai Chi-Chi Gung exercise.

One of the aims of *Tai Chi* is to develop the intrinsic energy (*Chi*) within the body through slow, rhythmical breathing exercises known as *Chi Gung*.

These ancient martial art exercises naturally relieve tension from stress, as well as aches and

pains from stiff limbs. Perform them whenever you wish to unwind and loosen up, but they are particularly beneficial in the early morning when the *Chi* is especially clean and light, relaxing and energizing the mind and body for the start of a new day. In this simple and easy exercise, inhale

through the nostrils with slow, even, steady breaths while you raise both hands to head height.

While raising the hands, place particular emphasis on relaxing the neck and shoulder muscles, as well as keeping the arms and hands relaxed and free of tension. Once your hands have

reached your forehead, slowly pivot them outwards and begin to trace an arc along either side of the body while you begin to slowly exhale through the nostrils.

Maintain a slow, even exhalation until your hands reach waist level. At that point, begin the cycle again by slowly inhal-

ing while you raise your hands back towards the forehead.


Before beginning, release the tension in the neck and shoulders by slowly rolling the shoulders forward and backward. Next, roll your head in a circle, keeping your neck loose, first to the right and then to the left.

Once you've completed five of these rotations, place your hands over your center (*Tan Tien*) and relax into a comfortable, forward-facing posture.

Sequence




Step 1: Place your feet shoulder-width apart, knees slightly bent, with your hips tucked gently underneath the spine (back straight). Relax your shoulders and hold your head up, but keep your neck relaxed. Place your hands over your *Tan Tien* and breathe calmly through your nose.



Step 2: Begin the exercise by slowly inhaling through the nostrils, relaxing your abdomen and slowly raising your hands toward your head.



Step 3: Continue to inhale while allowing your hands to rise without engaging the shoulder and neck muscles.



Step 4: When your hands are level with your forehead, slowly pivot them outwards and begin to exhale through the nostrils, allowing your abdomen to slowly contract.



Step 5: Continue to exhale while tracing an arc with your hands, releasing any tension in your neck and shoulders.



Step 6: Continue to exhale while maintaining a sense of calm and relaxation.



Step 7: When your hands reach waist level, slowly turn them over and repeat the cycle, inhaling and raising your hands toward your head once again. Allow the abdomen to relax and slowly expand as you begin to inhale. Continue this exercise for fifteen minutes to begin a calm, relaxed morning.



Step 8: To complete the exercise, cross your hands over your *Tan Tien* and gather the *Chi* within.

lished following the merger of Lloyds, a long established UK Bank, and the Trustee Savings Bank, once a quasi-government bank. At that time, the government was not in a political corner and the merger went smoothly.

In 2008, they were asked to rescue Halifax/Bank of Scotland (HBOS). Lloyds was only too aware of how long their competitors had been in business. The Bank of Scotland was formed in 1695, only a year after the creation of the Bank of England. No doubt a lot of patriotic statements were made to the then Lloyds TSB. Lloyds TSB did not carry out their normally protracted due diligence. This was an emergency situation, HBOS was going to collapse and be taken over by the British government.

Now, losses in Lloyds Banking Group – as the combined entity is now known - have forced the Gordon Brown government to control the bank. The CEO of Lloyds Banking Group states that 80% of their losses were caused by HBOS and without the merger they would have been able to continue independently. The moral of the story: beware of politicians bearing gifts and spouting patriotism.

A similar situation exists in the US with the Bank of America takeover of Merrill Lynch and Wells Fargo's takeover of ailing Wachovia. Politicians in the UK are still trying to divert attention away from the facts. The recent announcement that Hedge Funds will be more closely regulated is a prime example. Certainly, Hedge Funds can be regulated more, but the benefits are doubtful. It was not Hedge Funds that lent money like drunken sailors.

The credit crunch was created by short-term greed. It had its origins in America, spread to the balance of the Anglo Saxon world and now the fallout is being felt by the rest. People wanted to have a higher standard of living than they could actually afford. This is nothing new, but the old stigma about hire purchase and debt had disappeared.

Having spent years lending money for financial institutions, collecting it and even acting as a bank advances inspector, I am aware of how closely banks can regulate bad debt.

The credit crunch is actually quite simple; banks chose to ignore some of the risks in their only; they intended to bundle loans together and sell them at a good market price.

For them to raise the highest prices for this debt, it was necessary to have a very high investment-grade credit rating. Considering that the entities paying the credit rating agencies were the banks, it was simply the old story of, 'whoever pays the piper calls the tune'.

With the credit rating agencies applying the rubber stamp, the banks were in a serious new market. However, this was an extremely sophisticated 'scam', so complex that most bank CEOs and CFOs did not actually understand what they were dealing with. This, to a great extent, also applied to the credit-rating agencies. Warren Buffett, the legendary investor, put it this way: "Beware of geeks carrying formulas".

Alan Greenspan, former Chairman of the US Federal Reserve, admitted that he never believed that banks would act against their own interests. Greenspan was right but he didn't think the matter through. The best interests of a bank became the best interests of the executives who collected huge bonuses for usually opaque, but highly profitable parts of the bank's business.

The whole culture of banking had moved from bonuses being a 13th cheque, to one where millions of pounds or dollars could be awarded to a small number of insiders.

cases. Another phenomena that has accompanied the rise in strange financial products has been the move from science and mathematics to finance by aca-

Previously, top graduates in the first two disciplines went on to have predictable careers. For the past 20 years a substantial percentage have moved to finance and banking. Research shows that money was the prime factor. The majority, it appears, would have preferred to stay in their original professions.

In an unprecedented interview with the media for the benefit of the public, the Chairman of the US Federal Reserve Ben Bernanke stated that the US economy will end its recession in late 2009, albeit with a few caveats. Recovery will start during 2010 and a few green shoots of economic upturn can be seen already. Certainly, it's not all bad news. Paul Donovan, Senior International Economist at UBS, said a year ago, "We will not be spiraling downwards forever".

In a public phone-in interview with CNBC, Warren Buffet pointed out that many banks were enjoying a pleasant position this year. The reason: cost of funds for banks are very low and they can lend with high margins.

An internal memo from Citigroup sent by its CEO Vikram Pandit was 'leaked' to the media. It revealed that he had stated that business was good in January and February. Bank of America, Barclays and others have concurred.

There is that small problem of what to do with all that 'toxic stuff' on the balance sheet. From a banker's perspective, if they can ruin their own shareholders, why worry about taxpayers?

Asia's face of football

n ever-present face on Singapore-based ESPN Star Sports, John Dykes has fashioned a highly successful career fronting the network's football coverage.

As well as anchoring all live games, John also hosts Football Up Close, First Edition and the pugilistic pundit show Football Focus, in which his prodigious powers of equanimity are routinely tested by the opinionated and combative panel of experts.

During a recent visit to Phuket, John sat down with me to talk exclusively about an upcoming ESPN Star Sports charity at Laguna, as well as all matters football, including how he manages to prevent Steve McMahon from throttling Shebby Singh, on the weekly *Football Focus* show.

On meeting John, one thing becomes immediately apparent: here is a man who loves the game of football.

His obvious passion for 'the beautiful game', combined with an extensive knowledge and insight into the sport – rare attributes for someone who has never played professionally – has seen this gifted presenter ascend to the top of his profession.

Born in Essex, England in 1964, John's appetite for Asia was whetted early on in life when he accompanied his father on a posting to Hong Kong.

Back home, John enrolled in an English literature degree course but says it was a largely unrewarding experience.

College did, however, mark his baptism into the world of broadcast media when he signed up to work for the university radio station.

Leaving university after one year, John headed back to Hong Kong, where he landed a job with the *South China Morning Post* as a sports writer before branching out into entertainment and feature writing. John's work soon attracted the attention of a local English language TV station, which offered him a slot on a program as a film critic.

Before long, he was hosting the show.

John's love of sports, however, soon saw him abandon the world of entertainment to work as a freelancer for Rupert Murdoch's Star Sports.

The 1997 merger between Star Sports and ESPN Asia entailed a relocation to Singapore, where John had the opportunity to present a number of memorable events, including the 2000 and 2001 Champions League finals.

It was ESPN Star Sports' purchase of the Asian TV rights to the English Premier League that finally cemented John Dykes

position as Asia's 'face of foot-

The arrival of 'Mr Premier League' on the island was to finalize preparations for the forthcoming ESPN Star Sports charity weekend, which will be held at Laguna Phuket Golf Club and the British International School on March 28-29.

For the past two years, Laguna and ESPN STAR have joined forces to raise money to help underprivileged people around Phuket and its neighboring provinces.

The inaugural event in 2007 raised funds for the Life Home Project and last year, John and the team returned to Phuket and helped Laguna raise 750,000 baht for the Baan Klongsai school in Phang Nga.

Prior to the event, the school was in desperate need of repair. Over 100 school children were crammed into three small classrooms that flooded regularly.

The roof and walls were rotten and infested with termites, while all the children and teachers were forced to share just a single toilet. The children had few audio-visual materials and most of the school's computers were broken.

A year on, and the children of Baan Klongsai school now have a facility where they can be educated safely, with the hope of a brighter future.

How did John feel about being able to give so much back?

"Tremendous. I work out of a little green virtual studio in Singapore and you have two or three cameras pointing at you on a Saturday night when everyone is at home watching football.

"It's great, but you're very conscious that there's a world out there watching and it needs quantifying sometimes. When we go out and visit Asian countries, people say, 'oh we know you'.

"Maybe they don't know your name but they'll point and say ESPN Star Sports, that's very rewarding," he says.

"If you then get beyond that, 'ooh they know me', to, 'what positive spin can we put onto that fact that there's a visibility to who we are and what we do', it takes us to what we've been doing for the last couple of years here at Laguna. It's a tremendous initiative.

"It's fantastic because there's a clear connection. You feel that they say that I met the guy from the TV *and* we've got a new roof. Its exciting and positive in a way that's practical and works," John adds.

With so many destinations in close proximity to ESPN STAR's Singapore base, what made the team decide on Phuket ahead of others?

"One of the fascinating things about Phuket, is that there's this incredible community around

Asia of people who, for one reason or another, we've crossed paths with for sometime.

"Whether it's people who worked as presenters or pundits or people who've played football at the Hong Kong Football Club, there's a corporate community that works with us in terms of sponsoring our programs or knows us from the work we do around the region.

"It just so happens that Phuket is a tremendous melting pot of all those people. The fact that they cross the divide to the local community makes it as good a place as you can find," he concludes.

It's time to take the Alien Employment Act out of the twilight zone

The recent arrest of Canadian condominium owner James Nixon on charges of working in Thailand without a work permit once again highlights the need to revise the language in the Alien Employment Act to more accurately define what does – and does not – constitute work.

Under the current Act, the word 'work' is broadly defined to cover any mental or physical exertion that results in 'benefits' to another person, regardless of whether or not the accrued 'benefits' are financial in nature - or even whether the foreigner who performed the so-called 'work' received remuneration for it.

With such an expansive definition, one is limited only by the imagination in the number of ways that a foreigner could conceivably be charged with violating the Act.

Consider if you will a person who jumps into the sea and successfully saves the life of a drowning child. Such an undertaking would certainly entail a great deal of physical and mental exertion on that person's part – and doing so would bring the maximum possible benefit to the person saved: the gift of life.

As bizarre as it may seem, the Labor Ministry could reasonably argue that the hero or heroine in such a case should be arrested for breaking the law, at least given its current wording.

While such a scenario is of course extreme, a quick search of the Gazette's Issues & Answers archives reveals the extent to which Labor Department officers can and do advise foreigners of the need to obtain a work permit for a variety of quite marginal tasks.

One of the numerous examples came from a reader who, in July last year, was advised by the Phuket Employment Office that he would need a permit to help his Thai wife prepare the coconut pudding she sells from a motorbike side-cart.

While current statutes of labor law are correctly intended to reserve most jobs for Thai people capable of doing them, the unnecessarily broad definition of what constitutes work in the current form of the Act creates too much scope for people to abuse the law in order to settle personal scores or engage in extortion.

There are of course two sides to every story, but the Gazette will follow with interest the case of Mr Nixon, who was imprisoned for serving on a condo owner's management board while thousands of other foreigners on the island are doing real work for real pay under the table, but still in full view of the authorities.

Although I love children, I have never actually had a family of my own. Without the responsibility of raising a family, I am able to devote my time and energy to the children at the village, who I have been taking care of since March 2, 2007, just before it opened its doors in June of that

There are currently 33 boys and 47 girls living in nine different houses with their stepmums and dads. Because of the relationship we have, I am very close to the children, probably closer than their real parents.

At Sunshine Village we teach the older children to help take care of the younger ones. Many of the children find this difficult to begin with because the younger children in their house are not their real brothers and sisters. After time, as they grow accustomed to life here, the younger ones begin to look upon the older children as their real family and vice-versa.

It is often very hard for them when they first start living here especially the younger ones. They don't listen to their caretakers or step-parents, which is understandable, given the situation that they are in. Most of the children are happy and lively but some, especially when they are young, suf-fer personality and behavioral problems. Some are perpetually gloomy or are constantly angry, which is again understandable.

I, together with the house step-mums, have to talk with them and it is my responsibility as director to ensure that the stepmums are taking good care of them. If a child is having real prob-

lems, we sometimes ask psychologists to talk with them, which is always helpful. If a child's problems are too severe or could possibly bring harm to others within the village, we will ask him or her to leave, but this would only ever happen as an absolutely last re-

The village staff always keep an eye on children who are being naughty or too loud. However, I feel that it is important to know that with these children, it is usually better to be too loud than too quiet.

If a child has a serious problem or is sick, I will always try to resolve the problem on my own first, before asking the board for help. As director, I am required to report to the village board monthly.

The village board, in turn, has to coordinate with the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security to ensure that records remain up-to-date in accordance with Thai regulations.

We provide many activities for the children both inside and outside the village.

Volunteers come in to teach them English or Chinese and they can also study Buddhism, mathematics and go to camps.

At Sunshine Village, we teach the children aged between two and six years old in our own nursery. We have two primary teachers and a babysitter to help care for them. Children living outside the village often come here to study.

When the children turn seven they start going to the Ban Koh Sireh School, which is just five minutes away from the village. They are walked to school and picked up every day by at least two village step-mums.

The village also supports the students with their education after they finish high school by helpthe perfect role models for the children who they now look af-

We are always accepting mums and dads to help look after

the children, the pre-requisite being that they love kids and have the time to devote to the village. They must be single or have

no responsibilities to their own families. Sadly, we are unable to offer much in terms of salary to our staff. However, we are never short of volunteers.

There are plans to extend our facilities and programs if we have more than 120 children at the village, although money is always an issue. Expenses for food, electricity and water total around 400,000 baht per year, so we have to teach the children to save wa-

I did consider retiring but instantly changed my mind when I thought about the children. It is a very challenging job and sometimes I want to give up, but I love these children, so it's hard for me to see them disappointed.

I enjoy working here and plan to do so until I am not strong enough to do the job anymore. When I do retire I know someone good will replace me and that the children of the Sunshine Village will remain in good hands.

I wholeheartedly agree with all the checks that should be completed and would urge any parent to ask to see the License of the preschool, nursery or childcare center before allowing their child to attend. As for Walter Goossens' statement regarding different scandals relating to teachers in the past, the staff that we employ are qualified, have references and we trust them im-

Good karma Hybrids and plug-ins are apparently all the rage. Many such vehicles were exhibited at January's Detroit auto show. One car that was more or less ignored by the world's media deserves greater exposure; the fascinating Fisker Karma.



ith the introduction of the Fisker Karma, the world's first luxury plug-in hybrid, Fisker Automotive, a "green" American car company, is poised to change the landscape of the automotive industry. In the past, Fisker said that being ecoconscious often meant sacrificing something for the greater good of the planet. However, with the Karma, luxury automobile consumers will have the ability to buy an environmentally-friendly vehicle without making a sacrifice as the car still delivers the superior style and luxury they desire.

Over the past 18 years in car design, Henrik Fisker has left his thumb print on some of the most highly regarded automobiles.

His creations range from the BMW Z8 and the Aston Martin DB9 and V8 Vantage, to his most recent creations, the Tramonto and Latigo CS, designed under the Fisker Coachbuild nameplate. With the launch of Fisker Automotive, Fisker was inspired to keep the excitement in car design alive. This time, a new element was considered in the overall design, delivering a beautiful car that makes environmental sense. The concept was created between two independent companies that wanted to make a difference not only to the automotive industry, but also to the environment. Fisker Coachbuild and Quantum Technologies announced this joint venture in September 2007. Fisker Coachbuild provides the exclusive design services while Quantum Technologies – a publicly traded company – provides the latest technological advancements. In the Karma, a driver is able to select between two modes of driving. The first mode is stealth drive, the quiet economy mode for optimal relaxed and efficient driving. By flipping the second paddle behind the steering wheel, the car will switch to sport drive, accessing the full power of the vehicle. Regenerative brakes are featured to capture braking energy, while a low center of gravity provides optimal sport vehicle driving dynamics.

Performance figures indicate the different extremes of the two alternatives. In stealth mode, 100 km/h is reached in 7.5 seconds, with a maximum of a shade over 150 km/h. In sport, the sprint time is reduced to 5.8 seconds and top speed upped to 200 km/h. Statistics show that the majority of pollution from automobiles occurs on consumers' daily commute to and from work or dropping the kids off at school.

Currently, more than 60% of Americans and Europeans are driving less than 80 kilometers on their daily commute. If this 60% of commuters would drive a plugin hybrid like the Karma, it would see the fastest possible reduction both in oil consumption and emissions without sacrificing daily driving habits. Additionally, plugin hybrids have the potential to augment the planning of cleaner electrical power plants, ultimately producing a dramatic effect on society and future generations.

The Karma's configuration consists of a small gasoline engine that turns the generator, charging the lithium-ion battery pack that powers the electric motor and drives the rear wheels. The design allows owners to drive the car emission-free for up to 80km a day provided the car is charged every evening.

It is conceivable that if Karma owners follow this daily routine, they will only need to refuel the car around once a year.

This will cut down on pollution and global warming, and con-

sumers' gasoline budgets.

Fisker will also offer partly self-contained climate control, as buyers will have the option to purchase a full-length solar roof that will help charge the car and provide cooling for the interior cabin while the vehicle is parked. Ad-

ditionally, Fisker Automotive will offer customers the option of purchasing a set of solar panels for their roofs or garages where they can generate electricity during the day to charge the car overnightall cost and emission free.

Initial production is antici-



Flowers of Fortune

ll Thais fervently be lieve in luck or since they are essentially optimists by nature, in good luck. This is why they 'make merit' by offering gifts to images of Buddha, or to their local wat [temple]; why they are avid buyers of lottery tickets - including dodgy 'black market' ones; why they play cards for a

few baht and risk a criminal record even in the privacy of their own homes.

There are lucky colors for particular days, crazes involving lucky charms, and oh yes, lucky plants.

If there are fewer sacred trees than in India, there are revered trees in Thailand as well

varieties mostly too big for the average garden, but which can be found in the ample grounds of temples: for example, the nosegay frangipani – sometimes known as the temple tree; the orange blossoming asoka [saraca indica or sok] which is sacred to both Hindus and Buddhists because the prophet was born beneath its shade; the bo or bodhi tree [ficus religiosa or thon po] under whose ample branches Buddha is reputed to have achieved enlightenment; and the ironwood [hopea odorata or thakian thawng] which, in rural Thailand, is believed to be inhabited by a female ghost that can bring good luck.

There are others here in Phuket, but they are mostly beyond the ken of the domestic gardener. But lucky plants? A different story.

When I was planning the new garden, I was told in no uncertain terms that I must have plants that would bring us good fortune.

Only today, I was again reminded of this imperative. Waiting at the interminable traffic lights near Central Festival, I purchased my usual lucky garland from a Thai lady who both makes

and sells them to passing motorists; as usual, my Thai passenger wai'ed before draping it over the driving mirror.

These *leis* perform a double function: one, they give off an alluring fragrance for a few days that helps mask the traffic fumes; two, some of the flowers are considered to be harbingers of good fortune – the pair of champaca

> at each end, the jasmine blooms [sampac], and even the white Indian milkweed buds [calatropis gigantea], the beads in the necklace as it were, which are included in the garland because they last and last.

> This last named lactiferous shrub, which also has attractive light

green leaves, grows on waste lots around the island and will, freely watered, take readily from cuttings. So my 'dok Rak' in the garden came free of charge.

That it is regarded as lucky by some Thais is probably more due to its medicinal qualities – the milk is used in the treatment of ringworm - than any sacred associations.

This raises an interesting point about so-called lucky plants: most of them have healing properties, and are therefore lucky in a health-giving, restorative sense. This is not to deny their presence in religious myths.

Though the figure is smaller in Buddhist iconography, there are at least fifty plants, shrubs and trees associated in Asia with Hindu deities.

I digress... to return to my lucky garland. The second component consisted of tubular jasmine flowers.

Varieties of sweet smelling jasmines were always going to be part of my gardening plans: the star jasmine [multiflorum], the Arabian jasmine or jessamine [sambac], the chinese box or orange jasmine [murraya paniculata] and the unscented dwarf cultivar [parkeri]. All are

evergreen, all are reasonably hardy, all of them are now established in shady areas of my borders between taller shrubs. And some of them are considered propitious as well.

The final element in my *lei*, the pair of champak flowers [michelia champaca], was a plant I was very familiar with from my earliest days in Phuket. Years before, my Thai neighbor in Chalong had planted these shrubs all along the street - one for each house – in a gesture promoting both friendship and good karma with all the new homeow-

The champak, a tropical evergreen from the magnolia family, is both fragrant and lucky. Its blooms, both cream and apricot colored, are so intensely perfumed that their oil is used to make incense. Indeed, it is the key ingredient in 'Joy', one of the world's most exclusive fragrances.

In Asia, the shrub is held sacred both by Hindus – its flowers form one the darts of love and by Buddhists who link it to Maitreya, the eighth Buddha. So naturally I had to have a specimen champak in a grassy position where it could, with luck, grow into a medium-sized tree.

Even more strongly scented, in fact cloyingly so, is the infrequently produced flower of the corn plant [dracaena fragrans], another shrub considered to be propitious by many Thais.

It is often grown in containers with its stems interwoven like a basket. Mine came in a pot, but unhappy there, is now in the main garden. It keeps company with two variegated versions which came as bare canes.

They have now produced rosettes of that familiar swordshaped foliage from the leaf scars. So far no flowers.

Two other lucky plants are flourishing in containers at the front of my house.

One, a mistletoe fig [ficus deltoidea], which is often sold at local open-air markets, has a mass of round dark-green leaves and fruits that resemble tiny figs. Outside the garden, it may be seen growing in the forks of large trees.











My Thai friend says it brings luck in relation to money. Locals believe the same of another pot plant which has large, leathery dark green leaves and an aversion to sun. Mine has ribbon tied around its base – so much is it a symbol of good fortune in the household.

It doesn't turn heads and I do not yet know its botanical title, but its Thai name is the giveaway 'septee pan larn' which roughly translates as 'wealthy to the tune of a thousand million'.

Maybe it's time I had a flutter on the black lottery....





The enigma of property development costs

n recent days one of the most have heard from people overseas and locally has

been "are build costs seeing big reductions, given the current slowdown?" While it is a very straightforward question, in reality it is much more complex, without necessarily having a 'yes' or 'no' an-

Firstly, it is important to differentiate between build costs and development costs. Added to that – whether you are building a single home or 100 of them - are'hard' and 'soft'

Hard costs

for the most part relate to the actual costs of labor and materials.

Soft costs incorporate such things as contractor's overheads, consultants, architects, legal procedures and so on.

The consensus among contractors and quantity surveyors on the island is that hard build costs have come down by 10-12%. The much anticipated price reductions for commodities such as steel and concrete are not, however, materializing on the scale that many people believe they should be.

One of the bigger variable frequently asked questions I overheads is contractor's profit, and while there is no sign of significant movement in this area,

there is certainly some degree of flexibility.

One of the consequences of the current economic crisis has been the suspension of ongoing projects, with many builders seeing delays or in many cases defaults on projects. Looking at the scale of the island's construction companies, there is not enough financial depth for them to cover these nonpayments.

Therefore, effective risk management has

now become paramount as a means to remain solvent. The knock-on effect is that risk is being 'priced in', thus preventing a significant reduction in overheads.

Notwithstanding, while demand is down in every sector, there is still building going on much of it the top-end villa type product funded by cashed up Thai companies with access to strong balance sheets and debt.

For larger residential and commercial developments, consulting fees can add significantly

to the overall cost.

For the likes of architects, project managers, quantity surveyors, civil engineers and landscapers, the contraction of supply will signal the survival of the fittest over the coming few years. Many of these are saddled with large fixed costs and continue to carry staff and other overheads from the boom years.

We will now see many of them exploring all manner of opportunities to keep revenue streams coming in.

Other soft costs for projects for sale are mainly those related to selling – commissions, sales and marketing.

There appears to be a trend emerging in which agents are now looking to compensate for the dearth of available buyers by upping their commission rates

from 3% to 4-5% and even reaching double digits in some cases, where the seller is desperate to free up capital.

Legal services inevitably but necessarily bloat the bottom line, as these are required for sales and purchase agreements, registration of titles or leases and a host of other matters pertaining to the transactions.

Legal fees are a bit like medical costs: they never seem to go down. A few of the larger firms I have spoken to have managed to buck the current trend and now see new work coming in as the current situation continues.

Which leads us back to where we began. Yes, there have been some decreases in the cost of construction materials and yes, many professional consultants do have a certain amount of pricing flexibility that was not present in the past. That said, in a macro market such as Phuket, the best and the brightest have and will continue to remain in demand. Ultimately, if you want the best, you will most likely pay a premium.

Over the longer term, it is doubtful whether there will be significantly lower build costs, due to market size and the sheer amount of work currently underway. This situation is likely to continue until there is some sort of recovery in the next few years.

For those wanting to see lower build costs, the best option is to focus on the front end of a build by returning to intelligent design and employing a good, professional team, ensuring quality engineering and preventing cost blow-outs at the end of the project.
