Pollution solution due in 2010

PHUKET CITY: Phuket City Municipality held a hearing on April 23 to present to the public its plan to build a second wasteto-energy incinerator, scheduled to go on-line in October, 2010.

About 300 government officers and members of the public attended the hearing, held at the Phuket Merlin Hotel.

Phuket Vice-Governor Worapoj Ratthasima chaired the hearing and Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwansupana outlined the basic details of the project.

In explaining the need for a second incinerator, Mayor Somjai presented figures that showed a continuing rise in the number of tourists traveling to Phuket, with the figure reaching 5.6 million – spending some 110 billion baht – in 2008.

These figures, coupled with an increasing resident population, have resulted in an average annual increase in the volume of garbage generated on the island of 9% in recent years, she said.

By 2019, the figure is expected to reach 1,000 tonnes daily – almost double the figure of 540

tonnes per day in 2008.

The design capacity of the existing incinerator is just 250 tonnes per day.

The current cost of incineration amounts to about 600 baht per tonne, with the local administrative bodies charged 300 baht per tonne of waste delivered and the central government paying an additional 300 baht per tonne.

Every day almost 300 tonnes of excess waste is dumped on 120 rai of Forest Department land that is already full to capacity.

For lack of an alternative, the pile of refuse continues to grow, increasing the threat of a repeat of the June 2007 ecological disaster when heavy rains caused a toxic plume of water to enter surrounding mangroves and waters, killing millions of farmed fish.

After years of unsuccessful requests to the central government for a budget to fund construction of a second incinerator, the municipality and the Governor's Office signed a contract late last year with PJT Technology Co Ltd to build a second plant at Saphan Hin.

The plant will use "refuse derived fuel" and "mass burn system" technologies, as recommended by researchers at King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi, who will oversee the construction work.

The plant will house two incineration streams each capable of incinerating 300 tonnes of waste daily, thus raising the combined capacit y of both plants to 850 tonnes per day, the meeting

To profit from its investment, PJT will initially get 300 baht per tonne it incinerates. Additional income will come from the sale of electricity to the local grid.

Phuket City Municipality will oversee the management of the plant.

Three Phuket men charged with encroachment

BANGKOK: Three Phuket businessmen presented themselves at the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) in Bangkok on April 28 to face allegations of land encroachment at Koh Yao Yai in Phang Nga.

Pol Lt Col Prawuth Wongsrinil, head of the DSI's Consumer & Environment Protection Unit, identified them as Thawat, Thara and Prasit Tantipiriyakij.

A fourth man, Bumrung Wongchumpist, has also been accused.

Mr Bumrung notified the DSI that he would present himself on May 26, but Lt Col Prawuth said that was unsatisfactory and wants him to report "as soon as possible" to hear the charges.

The DSI informed the three suspects that the agency, a part of the Justice Ministry, has evidence to prove them guilty of encroachment on 13 hillside plots covering about 500 rai in Koh Yao Yai Village 3, Lt Col Prawuth

"This is state land that noone has ever had the right to occupy," he said.

The lengthy DSI investigation revealed that Land Department officials in 1978 illegally issued NorKorSor 3 title deeds on the land, despite it being part of a national forest reserve.

In 2006, the plots were sold to Bangkok-based developer Naracha, which planned a hotel and villa project on the land with

a marina at Klong Son Beach.

With the help of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), a group of local fishermen managed to scuttle the marina project even after it had been authorized by the Phang Nga Governor and the Marine Transport Department.

The NHRC argued that new regulations put in place after the 2004 tsunami entitled local people to a say in coastal development and that the public hearing had failed to accurately gauge public

After the protest gained national media attention, Naracha agreed to abandon the marina project, saying it was the villagers "own loss" since it would have

been available for their use.

However, Naracha continued to clear and pave over hillsides in preparation for the resort and villa project.

Residents of nearby Ban Yamee then claimed the developers dammed a section of local watercourse for their own use, cutting off the village wa-

Following complaints by the villagers, DSI investigators made about 10 visits to the site and interviewed locals, officials and developers.

They determined that the original title deeds were issued illegally and made formal charges against the four men.


HOLE PLUGGED: A team of frogmen sealed a hole in the tank of a sunken fishing vessel off Satun's Koh Lipe on April 24, stopping an oil leak that left some island beaches blackened earlier in the week.

The oil leak was first noticed early on April 18 at Ao Pramong, on the north coast of Koh Lipe. In an all-day operation, ten teams of two divers each managed to survey the wreck of the 70-meter vessel.

After finding the source of the leak, a one-inch diameter hole where a bolt had come undone, they inserted a plug to temporarily stop the leak. Frogmen also collected pure samples of the oil, which was originally thought to be bunker oil but now appears to be motor oil.

Burrowes free after paying Bt500 fine

PHUKET CITY: The Simon Burrowes saga appears to have finally come to a conclusion as the Englishman pleaded guilty to a charge of being impolite to a state official and was fined 500 baht.

Burrowes was due to fly back to the UK on January 31, but became involved in an altercation with Immigration Police officials at Phuket International Airport, who suspected his passport was fake.

Mr Burrowes lost his temper with the immigration officials, whom he had accused of laughing at him.


He was subsequently arrested and spent the next three weeks in Phuket Provincial Prison before his release on bail.

The incident, which caught the attention of the British media, was widely publicized internationally.

Mr Burrowes appeared before Phuket Provincial Court again yesterday and walked away a free man after paying a courtordered fine of 500 baht (approx US\$14.28).

He had originally intended to plead not guilty but, faced with the prospect of a prison sentence, was persuaded to change his plea.

"If I had pleaded not guilty, this could have gone on for a while and I could have got anything up to three years, so I decided to stop

fighting. I was forced to plead guilty," he explained.

He has been stuck in Thailand since his release from prison, but now that the case is over he is hoping to return to his native England.

"They returned my passport, but the visa has expired so that is now being processed. I don't know how much that is going to cost; hopefully, it won't cost me anything," he said.

Perhaps surprisingly, Mr Burrowes is not desperate to leave Thailand for his home in the UK.

"I'd like to stay here for a bit longer, just to relax for a few days. I also need to raise funds for my flight home, which might take a while. The flight I missed was non-refundable," he said.

"I doubt I will ever come back. Thailand is not a bad place, but I have had an awful experience here," he said.

According to Phuket Immigration Superintendent Chanatpol Yongbunjerd, Mr Burrowes now faces a 20,000 baht fine for overstaying his visa while he was incacerated.

"Mr Burrowes can request that Phuket Airport Immigration pay that fine if he is unable or unwilling to do so himself," said Mr Chanatpol.

Airport authority lowers landing fees again

MAI KHAO: Airports of Thailand (AOT) is to make a further reduction in landing fees at the six airports under its control, including Phuket International Airport (PIA).

In a bid to help struggling airlines, battered by dire economic conditions and Thailand's continuing political turmoil, fees will now be reduced by 30%. Parking fees will also be waived for aircraft spending less than 24 consecutive hours on the tarmac.

Passenger arrivals at PIA for the January to March period are down 18.7% year-on-year. January to March 2008 saw 865,837 passengers, while this

year the same period saw just 704 124

The organization had already reduced landing fees by 20% following the yellow-shirt protests that resulted in the shutdown of Suvarnabhumi and Don Mueang Airports late last year.

Demonstrations and violence by red-shirted protesters in Bangkok, as well as the humiliating cancellation of the Asean summit in Pattaya earlier this month, have prompted AOT to act again.

The new fees will come into effect on May 1 and apply until December 31, 2009.

AOT chairman Piyaphan Champasut said the move would

cost AOT 450 million baht, but that "AOT has to put Thailand first."

Meanwhile, Mr Piyaphan announced that AOT would cancel a 500-million-baht contract with Thai Airports Ground Services (Tags) to supply trolleys for use at Suvarnabhumi Airport.

AOT would also fine Tags two billion baht, despite AOT holding a 28.5% share in the firm.

In a seven-year supply and maintenance contract, Tags was to provide over 9,000 trolleys, yet Suvarnabhumi has only around 3,000 trolleys in use now, Mr Piyaphan said.

AOT has attempted to plug the gaps in trolley supply at Suvarnabhumi using trolleys from other airports, including PIA.

PIA Director Wicha Nernlop told the *Gazette*, "We sent around 500 trolleys to Suvarnabhumi Airport, but we still have enough trolleys in stock. Normally Phuket International Airport uses around 500 trolleys per day. In low season we use less than that."

The AOT also approved a plan to upgrade PIA. Upon completion of the project, the airport will be able to accommodate 11.5 million passengers per year.

The expansion will mean PIA will have a capacity of 20 flights per hour, or one every three minutes. Space for the parking of private jets will be expanded, while shopping facilities inside the terminal building will be improved.

Boat accident victims' relatives | Phuket ready urged to file claims

By Khunakorn Terdkiatkhachorn PHUKET CITY: Relatives of several victims of the Choke Somboon 19 disaster have yet to file insurance claims with underwriter AIG, which is waiting to pay out 200,000 baht for each of the deceased.

The seven victims were covered under a mandatory group insurance policy taken out by Dive Asia, which owned and operated the vessel that sunk in heavy seas on the night of March 8 while returning from a dive trip to the Similan Islands.

Rakchart Hongsaphirom, with AIG's Bangkok office, said the first 200,000-baht claim was paid on April 3 to Mrs Karnda Thepraksa, wife of the boat's cook Sorntat Jumpa.

Dive Asia has also received 200,000 baht and is arranging payment to the relatives of Japanese victim Yuba Hirotsuga.

AIG has tried to contact the embassies of the five European victims and will arrange payment once all the necessary paperwork has been completed, he said.

"So far neither the embassies nor the victim's families have contacted AIG about the insurance. We want them to contact us soon because it is our policy to make such payments within

one week of an accident. This is in order to maintain our good reputation," he said.

AXA Insurance, underwriters of the ill-fated vessel, paid out a Bt18.5 million insurance claim to Dive Asia on April 28. A ceremonial check was handed over to Dive Asia Director Benno Bradon at the Phuket AXA Insurance branch.

Pinyo Khertguntapong, manager of the AXA Phuket branch, said the company two years ago began offering marine hull insurance, which covers the loss or damage of a vessel from gale, shipwreck and a variety of other maritime disasters.

Despite Chokethe Somboon 19 tragedy, AXA still sees marine hull insurance as a growth market in Phuket and continues to offer policies, he said.

Due to the high costs, it was mutually agreed between Dive Asia and AXA not to try to salvage the 30-meter vessel, which now rests 70 meters below the surface about 12 nautical miles off Phuket.

for swine flu epidemic

PHUKET CITY: Despite no cases of "swine flu" being recorded in Thailand as this edition goes to print, public health officials are taking measures to prevent the spread of the virus into Phuket.

Pongsawad Ratanasang, director of the Public Health Office, told the media that he was not overly concerned by the danger posed to the island by this latest disease.

The island had previously been successful in containing the threat of infectious diseases such as SARS and avian flu, both of which were far more deadly than swine flu. It should not be beyond the capability of Phuket to control this disease, he added.

There are also about 1,000 doses of Tamiflu on the island, which is effective at treating the disease, Mr Pongsawad said.

Phuket and Samui are among five Thai airports that have installed high-tech thermoscanners to screen foreign passengers for swine flu.

The devices register an audible sound upon detecting anyone passing the scanner gates with a body temperature above 37 degrees Celsius – normal for healthy humans.

Each unit comprises an infrared thermal camera, a processor and a monitor to show the results of readings.

Travelers found with flu-like symptoms that could indicate H1N1 infection will be asked to undergo quarantine and treatment at state-run hospitals, Phaijit Warachit, deputy permanent secretary of the Public Health Ministry said.

Meanwhile, the Public Health Ministry proposed a package of swine flu prevention measures to the Cabinet on April 28, Deputy Public Health Minister Manit Nopamornbodi said.

Mr Manit said the ministry proposed to set up a committee chaired by Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva to monitor the problem.

It would be authorized to order a response and issue instructions to relevant agencies in order to implement swine flu prevention measures effectively and in a unified manner.

At the time of going to press, the new virus has killed up to 149 people in Mexico, with more people infected in the United States, Canada and Europe.

The World Health Organization (WHO) had raised its pandemic alert to phase 4, indicating a significantly increased risk of a global outbreak of a serious disease.

Four new roads planned for Phuket

PHUKET CITY: In a bid to ease traffic congestion, Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop will push four new road projects for the island, making the building of a second Chalermprakiat Road a top priority.

Gov Wichai told a press conference at Phuket Provincial Hall on April 27 that the ever-increasing number of cars on Phuket's roads makes expansion of the island's road network a necessity particularly the airport route.

Presently, Phuket has only Thepkrasattri Road to connect Phuket International Airport to other districts across the island.

With the airport's proposed upgrade allowing it to accommodate 11.5 million passengers a year, Gov Wichai said he was concerned about the impact an increase in arrivals would have on the island's roads.

"I want to finish construction of the second Chalermprakiat main road before the expansion of Phuket International Airport. If we have an airport unloading 11.5 million tourists a year before the expansion of the road is completed, it will spell traffic disaster on Thepkrasattri Road," he said.

The second Chalermprakiat Road's proposed route will follow the twin pylons from Phuket International Airport to the bypass road for a distance of around 21 kilometers. It is anticipated that this project will form a main channel which other new tributary roads will be able to feed into. It is also planned that heavy goods vehicles (HGVs) will be prohibited from using the new road.


The proposed roadway would not require the expropriation of any private sector land as it would be built on state land.

The Phuket Highways Department has requested a budget of three million baht from the governor, which it plans to use to engage a company from the private sector to carry out the necessary research and design work for the new highway. The department estimates that this work

should be able to be completed within a two-month period – considerably quicker than if the task were allocated to government highway officials.

The remaining projects will involve the construction of a new road from Chalong to Patong, connecting the road to Wat Luangpoh Supha in Chalong with 50 Pi Road, off Nanai Road in Patong; a road connecting Sakdidet Road to Saphan Hin; and an overpass at the Darasamuth School junction on the bypass road, near Central Festival Phuket.

Why Phuket is still married to the mob

On the afternoon of April 22, around 500 villagers blockaded Srisoonthorn Road in Baan Bang Tao, preventing any traffic from passing through the busy stretch. The protesters demanded that Cherng Talay Police arrest a man who had accidentally shot and killed a 12-year-old boy in front of several young witnesses. They claimed the authorities had failed to act quickly enough to apprehend the killer. The protesters dispersed the following afternoon, but by April 27 they were back on the streets, accusing the police of tampering with evidence at the crime scene. Was this "mob" action simply a case of villagers joining what appears to be a nationwide trend - or were they justifiably acting out of sheer desperation in the face of perceived police inaction and ineptitude? Tipwarintron Tanaakarachod and Dan Waites report.

pointing a .38 caliber pis tol at Amornthep "Gaga" Panya-sirikul's left temple. "I'm going to shoot you," he reportedly said.

It was around noon on Wednesday, April 22, and the 34year-old owner of the Dr Com Electronic Center was showing off in front of 12-year-old Gaga and three other boys who were there to play video games. Ekawood pulled the trigger twice. The chambers were empty. But when he pulled it a third time, the gun went off, sending a bullet through Gaga's head.

kawood Pipatratana was run, and 500 angry villagers had blockaded a stretch of Srisoonthorn Road in front of the shop, demanding that the police find Gaga's body and arrest Ekawood.

> It is perhaps difficult to imagine the shock that must have taken hold of those in the room when the gun went off. With Gaga convulsing and losing blood rapidly, Ekawood reportedly told the boys he would take him to Vachira Phuket Hospital. He put the boy's body in his car, closed up shop and drove off, taking his young son with him.

Gaga never reached the By the afternoon, Gaga hospital – at least not alive. Ekawood dumped his body in

marshland not far from Phuket Airport. He later told reporters that Gaga had died in the car before he could get to Vachira. He was in shock at the time, he explained.

After dumping the body, Ekawood drove to Bangkok to find his wife, who was attending a course there. This meant he was able to get through Tah Chat Chai checkpoint, the only land route off Phuket. Protesters would later question why police were unable to mobilize in time to prevent his escape.

From statements made by the boys present, it seems reasonable to believe Ekawood's own claim that the shooting was a tragic accident. At a press conference following his arrest, he appeared full of remorse. "I feel very sorry about what happened. I knew the boy very well and I didn't mean to take his life," he

He is to be charged with causing death through negligence, for which he could be sentenced to up to 10 years in jail. He will also be charged with attempting to conceal a body and a firearms

fort to Gaga's mother, who has lost her only son. "I have lost everything. My future has been ruined by that terrible gunman. I can never forgive him," she told the Gazette, struggling to hold back tears.

The protest

The incident that apparently sparked the protest was not the shooting itself, however. Protesters allege that when one of the young witnesses called to report the crime, police hung up on him.


When the *Gazette* put this accusation to Deputy Superintendent Siriwat Intrayim of Cherng Talay Police, he said that the police had received no such call. He claimed the boy had in fact called 1669, the emergency rescue hotline. He went on to say that operators on such numbers are used to receiving prank calls, which might explain the response.


Voravuth Maneesri, one of the protest leaders, questioned how Ekawood was able to get through Tah Chat Chai check-

"The police didn't even know where the murderer was; they thought he was still in Phuket, but he was in Bangkok. Why did they tell us that they checked the CCTV and didn't see the car pass through Tah Chat Chai checkpoint? The killer said that he left Phuket through Tah Chat Chai. Does that mean that the police didn't have the CCTV on?" he said. [see First Person, page 23, for an extended interview with Voravuth].

Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop admitted Ekawood shouldn't have been able to get off the island. "There's only one way to drive out of Phuket, and that's through Tah Chat Chai checkpoint. We really need to fix this problem," he said.

Lt Col Siriwat explained that police initially received a report that Gaga had been shot and been taken to Vachira Phuket Hospital. "We went to the hospital, but the boy wasn't there. After that I went to Tah Chat Chai,

and checked the CCTV footage taken from 12pm to 3pm," he said. It was while he was checking the CCTV footage that he received a report that a protest had started outside the Dr Com center, Lt Col Siriwat explained.

"So I had to drive back to the place where the accident happened and try to clear up the problem. But all I got was the question 'why have the police come so late?

He claimed that one of the protesters told him that after police found the boy's body, they would re-open the road.

At around 5.30pm, police found Gaga's body and Lt Col Siriwat informed the protesters. "I thought they'd open up the road then, but the answer wasn't what I thought. They told me 'now I can't control the situation, because there are too many people here now. I can't clear the mess.'

"I knew that was a lie. They didn't do as they promised [and re-open the road], and they even closed the road around Surin in another spot.

"The protesters then demanded police say how many days it would take them to have Ekawood in custody. I couldn't promise anything, because I really didn't know. What I did know is that we would do our best," Lt Col Siriwat said.

Gov Wichai visited the protesters at around 10pm. He is understood to have told them that if Ekawood was not in custody within three days, he would request a transfer out of Phuket.

According to Lt Col Siriwat, "Most of the people accepted this, only a few drunks weren't okay with it."

As it turned out, around 30 villagers continued to protest overnight. The protest was finally abandoned at 2.30pm on April 23, reportedly after the tiring demonstrators were assured the killer was about to be taken into custody.

Voravuth explained why some protesters were unsatisfied with the governor's assurances. "If you leave your job as governor here but then take up a job as governor somewhere else, does it make any difference? If they told me that if they failed to do their job properly they would quit and never take a similar job again, then I might buy it," he said.

Not the first time

The protesters claim they took to the streets after police failed to solve even one in a string of five alleged murders in the Bang Tao area. Voravuth's own nephew was recently killed in a hail of machine gun fire, he said.

"This was the last straw. Do you know how many incidents have happened before this? One happened just beside the police station recently. We talked to the police about it and the superintendent said that if he couldn't catch the murderer he would transfer himself. He did move, but only because they were going to move him anyway. And who takes responsibility? No-one," he said.

But when questioned on this, Lt Col Siriwat was quick to defend Cherng Talay Police's record. "The case of the murder with the M16 machine gun is already in court. The murder that took place near here, we've already caught some of the criminals, but there were many involved. Some we haven't caught yet," he said.

Three days after Ekawood surrendered himself, protesters

Timeline of events

Wednesday, April 22
12 noon: Ekawood Pipatratana accidentally shoots 12-year-old Amornthep "Gaga" Panya-sirikul in the head with a .38 caliber pistol inside Ekawood's Dr Com Electronic Center in Baan Bang Tao. Three other boys are present in the shop at the time of the shooting. Ekawood puts Gaga in his car, telling the boys he will take the victim to Vachira Phuket Hospital. Protesters later alleged that one of the boys called the police, only to be hung up upon by police who didn't believe his story. Meanwhile, Ekawood flees to Bangkok to find his wife.

3pm: After Gaga's parents call Vachira and are told that the boy has not been admitted, an angry crowd including the victim's family gathers outside the Dr Com shop. The protesters blockade a 300-meter stretch of Srisoonthorn Road in front of the shop, demanding Ekawood's immediate arrest.

5.30pm: Gaga's body is found by police, dumped in marshland in the Nai Yang area, south of Phuket Airport. By this time about 500 villagers have joined the protest.

9.30pm: Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop visits Gaga's home, the protest site and the police station. He assures the boy's family that Ekawood will be in custody within three days. Most of the protesters disband, though around 30 continue the blockade throughout the night.

Thursday, April 23

11am: Gaga's mother, Mrs Somjai Sudjit, takes the boy's remains home after identifying him at the Vachira Phuket Hospital morgue. **2.30pm:** The protest is finally disbanded following unconfirmed reports that Mr Ekawood was about to turn himself in to the authorities.

Friday, April 24

11am: Fearing he would be met by a lynch mob in Cherng Talay, a remorseful Mr Ekawood hands himself in at Phuket Provincial Police Station. He is accompanied by his wife and Sommit Suepsin, a member of Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO).

Monday April 27

3pm: On the final day of Gaga's funeral ceremonies, a police officer enters Dr Com along with two other men to collect equipment for customers who had brought equipment to the shop to be fixed. They are spotted by people attending the funeral at Wat Bang Tao, opposite the center.

4pm: Gaga's cremation ends. Suspecting that police are tampering with evidence in a crime scene, a crowd begins to gather again outside

6.30pm: About 300 people have gathered outside the shop, again blocking Srisoonthorn Road.

7.00pm: The police return the equipment removed from Dr Com. Within half an hour the protesters disband.

were back at the site of the shooting. Police had entered Dr Com, apparently to return computers to customers who had sent them to the shop to be fixed. Believing police to be tampering with evidence, the protesters set up another blockade. The protest was abandoned within an hour, but only after the police returned the equipment to the shop.

Regardless of the truth of the matter, there is clearly a perception among many Cherng Talay residents that police are not doing their jobs properly, a perception that even the arrest of Ekawood failed to change.

Voravuth admitted the protests might not solve the problems, but claimed they would help make the authorities aware of their duties.

"They should work for us, not put themselves above us. We're letting them know we're watching them, and we're showing them the right thing to do. We're not going to be silent anymore," he said.

Dim criminal robs police for police killing

PHUKET CITY: For a combination of stupidity and lack of ethics, few crimes in Phuket in recent memory can match that of a young man who tried to steal a charity donation box placed on the main counter of the Phuket City Police Station on April 21.

At 12:30pm that day, a police officer noticed that the charity donation box for the Foundation for Rehabilitation & Development of Children and Family had gone missing.

Checking the station's CCTV recording, the officers saw that the thief was a tall, darkskinned man with long hair.

Superintendent Wanchai Ekpornpit ordered his deputy Lt Col Chaiwat Auykham, Crime Suppression Inspector Prawit Sutthireuangarun and Inspector for Investigations Wijak Tarom to hunt down the criminal.

Lt Col Wijak has been dubbed "The Magnet" by the local media for his uncanny ability to solve difficult cases.

This particular investigation did not prove much of a challenge, however. At precisely 12:34pm – just four minutes after the crime was first noticed – The Magnet had got his man.

Lt Col Wichak spotted the man from the CCTV tape in the car park of the office of the nearby Phuket Police Co-operative. On seeing the officers, the suspect ran up towards Yaowarat Road. The Magnet and his men gave chase.

The officers caught the suspect when, fatigued, he stopped to rest outside the police dormitories on Yaowarat Rd. He was still clutching the donation box, which was damaged in the incident and has not yet been replaced.

The man, identified as 24year-old Imron Singkhan from Mai Khao, told police he had been out drinking with friends the night before.

On his way home he was arrested for drunk driving and forced to sleep at the police sta-

The following morning, as he was walking out of the station, he saw the unguarded donation box and - his judgement perhaps clouded from the night before – decided to steal it.

He has now been charged with theft as well as driving under the influence.

Pub owner arrested

SONGKHLA: More than 70 police officers swooped on a pub in the border town of Daan Nok, Sadao District on April 22 to arrest the pub's owner for the murder of a police officer who was shot dead earlier in the month.

Traithep "Od" Maekem was eventually found hiding in a bedroom in Member Pub on Soi Thai Janglon.

A search of the building uncovered a fully-loaded 11mm and a .357 calibre pistol and four full magazines of ammunition, police said.

The arrest followed the killing of Sen Sgt Maj Wimonwat Khaokaow, a drug suppression officer with Songkhla Provincial Police, who was shot dead on April 9 while on duty in Daan Nok, which when roughly translated means "outer limits".

The town has undergone tremendous growth over the last decade and is now a popular place for Malays to enjoy Thai-style night life without having to drive all the way to Haad Yai, located some 50

Songkhla Provincial Police Commander Wirun Iam-Phaichit said that Mr Traithep shot Sen Sgt Maj Wimonwat in Yahoo pub after the officer went to investigate a lead.

Mr Traithep and four other men then dragged Sen Sgt Maj Wimonwat's body out of the pub and shot up the dead officer's car to try and mislead police, Maj Gen Wirun said.

Maj Gen Wirun said that he had personally questioned Mr Traithep for more than an hour, but the suspect said that he would not give a statement until the case went to court.

Police have arrested three other men wanted for their involvement in the killing but are still hunting for one further suspect, identified as 49-year-old Sophon "Tik" Dissara.

Mr Sophon, a former policeman, is believed to be hiding out somewhere in Bangkok.

Manners maketh a monk

CHIANG RAI: In order to improve the manners of novices entering the Thai Sangha, a temple school in the north will launch the country's first "good manners" curriculum for novice monks, next month.

Phra Maha Wudhijaya Vajiramedhi, director of the Vimuttayalaya Institute, said that the course will be introduced at the Novice Demonstration School that he founded in Chiang Rai's Chiang Khong District.

The aim of the project is to educate novices so that they will -MCOT | have more appropriate manners and it also aims to solve the problem of homosexual practices among novices and monks.

The good manners curriculum comprises 75 Dharma principles focusing on the proper behaviour of monks and novices as taught by the Lord Buddha in Buddhism's 227 precepts.

"When the Lord Buddha was a prince, he was educated by his royal household. As a result, he had really good manners and was admired by Buddhists.

"The school has decided to introduce the curriculum to teach novices because I don't want people to lose their faith in novices and monks due to unbecoming conduct," said Phra Maha

"Every novice at the school will be taught the curriculum. We'll evaluate how the curriculum can help inculcate good manners in novices. If it succeeds in improving their manners, I'll expand the it to other novice schools nationwide," he concluded.

Healthy snack campaign launched



BANGKOK: In a bid to help reduce obesity in Thailand, the Public Health Ministry has convinced six snack producers to cut sugar, fat and sodium content in their products, Public Health Minister Wittaya Kaewparadaion said on April 22.

People nowadays consume more sugar, fat and sodium than is required by the body, resulting in ailments such as diabetes, heart disease, high-blood pressure and obesity, he said.

Mr Wittaya was speaking after signing a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with six snack food producers who agreed to cut the levels of fat, sodium and sugar in their products by 25% and make them available across the country. Four major food distributors also signed the MoU.

Under the plan, the manufacturers will launch their first batch of healthy products next month and make them available at schools, he added.

Citing a recent survey conducted by the ministry, Mr Wittaya said that child obesity has risen from 4% in 1999 to 13% this year. Most obese children live in urban areas, he said.

Owing to bad eating habits, youngsters could end up facing chronic ailments such as highblood pressure, coronary heart disease and strokes, he added.

Another study in 2006 found that children spent on average Bt26 a day or Bt9,800 a year on snacks, while parents only spent an average of Bt3,024 a year on school fees.



Chikungunya outbreak hits Songkhla

SONGKHLA: At least 5,000 people have been infected with the insect-borne Chikungunya virus since the beginning of this year, a senior public health official said on April 29.

Doctor Sanphet Ritthiraksa, a specialist on preventive medicine of the Songkhla Public Health Office, said that 5,036 Chikungunya sufferers had been detected between January 1 and April 27 this year.

Of those known to be suffering with the Chikungunya virus, some 3,007 patients were located in Sabayoi District, 1,387 patients in Sadao District, 328 patients in Thepha District and 314 patients detected in Nathawee District.

Water subsidy extended

BANGKOK: The Cabinet allocated a budget of Bt3 billion on April 28 to subsidize tap water fees for the poor for six more months, starting from April.

Home users, who use no more than 30 units of water, will be exempt from paying the water bills from April to September this year.

In addition, Tambon administrative organizations, that use no more Bt3,000 worth of tap water in the period, will also be exempt from paying water bills.

Students not proud to be Thai

BANGKOK: Only 38% of students surveyed feel proud to be Thai, an extensive new study has shown.

Conducted among 14,400 students, the survey was designed to investigate their feelings of "goodness", "happiness" and "pride" in being Thai.

Vocational and university students were not included in the study.

The findings showed that only 51% of those questioned said that they were happy with their studies, while about 63% described themselves as good people.

"The findings confirm we have embarked on the right track by improving history courses. Such an improvement can help make students more proud of their 'Thainess'," Education Minister Jurin Laksanawisit said on April


It is necessary for students to be proud of being Thai and uphold moral principles, he said.

"We must start by instilling the right attitudes. Children should be compassionate and have a sense of duty regarding public service.

"They should be happy about being Thai and living in Thai society," Mr Jurin said.



Looking at the milestones of Ao Nang



t's hard to believe I've been writing for the *Gazette* for nearly 10 years. How time goes by when you are having fun! As you can imagine, things have changed a lot here in Krabi in those 10 years, even more so in the eighteen years since I first came to Krabi

I went back to read some of my old articles from those early years, and had many a laugh. The comical memories of the excitement of the first electric sign being lit in Ao Nang can not be forgotten, for when the resort switched on the electric for their sign with great fanfare, they discovered they had spelled the resort's name wrong!

And how about the fish restaurant on the beachfront that used to cook its

orders by the numbers on the menu. If you ordered an entrée near the front of the menu with a low number, say number four, it was cooked before all the higher-numbered entrees. If you ordered number 47, you had to wait until the cook made all the lowered-numbered entrees first. I never ordered an entrée with a number higher than five.

The first ATM in Ao Nang was a major milestone. Hardly any of the villagers had ATM cards, nor had any idea what the machine was for, but they sure loved to push all the buttons. Now there are ATM machines every 15 meters or so. The installation of municipal water in 2001 brought Ao Nang into the big leagues and brought an end to the water-truck mafia. The opening of Centre Point that year was another high, or low, depending on your point of view.

Remember the 800-baht flights from Krabi to Phuket on Air Andaman? What a deal. Within 20 minutes you were in Phuket; as long as you didn't mind a white-knuckle flight on a 12-seater plane. You could fly to Phuket on the early-morning flight, do your shopping and what not, and return on the sunset flight the same day. It was so cheap I would buy an extra seat for all my shopping (cases of Corona beer!).

I reread an article that I wrote in 2000 titled, "If you wouldn't do it at home, don't do it here". I should probably reprint it every year for all the knuckleheads who come here and hand their money over to total strangers for investment deals or for those who come here to make trouble.

Some things haven't changed. The Last Café is still the coolest spot in town – now with the Last Fisherman and its nightly barbeques. La Luna Italian restaurant is still the oldest Italian restaurant in Ao Nang and has been serving good food for over 15 years. The owner, Silvano Silvagni, is always threatening that it is his "last year". He remains a most congenial host who loves to sip his wine.

And the tailors. We complained about them then and we complain about them now. In the year 2000, 28 tailors dominated tiny Ao Nang. Now the number has grown to nearly 50. That really isn't an astronomical increase. It's probably less in percentage terms than the increase in optical shops or longtail boats, but the tailor shop owners have diversified their businesses. Now they are taking over the restaurant industry.

At last count, there were nine Indian restaurants in Ao Nang and some 10 Italian restaurants run by south Asians, compared to the four authentic Italian restaurants actually run by Italians.

While we can all witness the explosion in the number of ATMs, optical shops, and longtail boats with a sense of resignation, one question remains. How do all these people get work permits to run the 50 tailor shops and twenty odd restaurants? What's the justification for the 51^{st} tailor shop to get a work permit? Even worse, these same people are reported to be selling pirated CDs and fake brand-name watches on the beach front. You'd think the locals wouldn't put up with it. But as we all know, money talks and it looks like Ao Nang sold out long ago.

Talking of money, and the changes in Ao Nang over the years, check out how the land prices have exploded exponentially. Even in the times of recession, they still seem to be stuck at higher levels. Case in point: a small 72 wah (288sqm) lot with 20sqm road frontage on Ao Nang Road, about 800 meters from the beach, is for sale at 21 million baht. That's less than one fifth of a rai. Wow! That makes my three rai (4800sqm) next door look pretty good!

Lady Pie

Sorry J.C, but yawn... Maybe a few of the island's liverish expats fit this stereotype, but many Phuket residents are fluent in Thai – even more so after a few drinks – while quite a few successful teetotal businessmen are absolutely hopeless at the local lingo. There were 42 responses to his polemic bile within 24 hours of it going online – a good few came from Thai-based British expats.

So, what better way to parry the scribblings of an overpaid boor on a dysfunctional, mist-shrouded island than by highlighting a hardworking, successful expat on Phuket. That would be Susan Usher – the island's very own "Lady Pie".

Susan, an Aussie 'can do' lady, is so far removed from J.C.'s ill-informed expat generalizations that it makes you wonder if the man – apart from getting knocked out by a Greek fisherman some years back (many thanks, Stavros, I owe you a beer) – has actually had any physical contact with foreigners abroad; with the exception of sharing on-location hotel bar elbow space with his cameramen, that is.

This Aussie lady never stops working and her products - meat pies, sausages, quiches, sausage rolls and floaters – are so appealing to farangs in Thailand that several of the island's "top gear" resorts and shopping marts feature them, along with many outlets in Bangkok.

So who's her marketing nley's ongoing "Expat manager? "Me," grins Susan. Who did the research and earned the relevant qualifications in order to meet the stringent food hygiene standards required to open

such a place? "Me," gr-ins Susan. And just who trains the staff, arranges deliveries, manages to have a sunny countenance every single day and was the first woman to bake and deliver a

pie on the Moon? You guessed it, Susan although that last part was a bit of whimsical pie in the sky (groan).

Lady Pie's restaurant itself seems a modest setup when compared to the chic, 'to-be-seen-in' restaurants at nearby Tinlay Place. Located along Srisoonthorn Road, several hundred meters from Cherng Talay on the right-hand side when approached from Heroine's Monument (not "The Heroin's Monument", as several guide books have it, but hey, I'm needling...). You can't

Susan has added a beauty salon to the side meaning that after a few Aussie pies, beans, all-day breakfasts and absolutely delectable sausage rolls, you can get yourself a facial and a trueblue, fair dinkum Aussie mullet.

We're famished. Joy selects an Aussie pie, mash, peas and onion gravy while I opt for the daily special – cottage pie with hydroponic salad, baked beans on the side and vegetable cuts. The little guy goes for a sausage roll with French fries, as does his mum. Susan orders an Aussie pie with mushy peas over the top a "floater" as I believe it's known in the Antipodean dictionary; but certainly not in the

Normal-size pies clock in at 75 baht, a 150 gram sausage roll 70 baht, desserts, 100 baht. Check out



Hot off the press!

hat's to be done? The world is imploding, the country is exploding, the red shirts are re-loading and it looks like the tourists have all gone to Bali. Where's the hope? Where's the joy? Frankly, I have no idea, but what I can tell you is that now is the perfect time to wallow in a bit of self indulgent pampering. And what better way to wallow than by absconding to the surreality of a five-star spa and treating yourself to one of the more luxurious massages available on this paradise island of ours.

Of course, massages come in many guises. There's the slow, sensual massage that will leave you feeling soothed and serene; intoxicated by the the fragrant aroma of the aromatic oils and

sue Thai massage, which is said to be the perfect tonic for those little kinks in the muscles and knots of stress.

With around 200 spas in Phuket, the choice is dizzying. But there are spas and then there are spas. One of the latter is 'Le Spa' located at Le Meridien Hotel in

As you would expect from Le Meridien, Le Spa provides a multitude of treatments. Pampered patrons can browse the 'menu" or seek a recommendation from one of the staff, all the while sipping a restorative herbal concoction, administered to ease you into a gentle state of relaxation and wellbeing.

On to the treatments, and one that comes recommended is the traditional massage, combined with a hot herb press – designed to relax the body, yet invigorate

Herbs are nature's antioxidants and the health benefits they bring are many and profound. Herbs have long been used as the basis of traditional Chinese medicine, with usage dating as far back as the first century CE.

Each of the 10 well-appointed massage rooms is lit by candle light, engendering a soothing and tranquil ambiance. A bath tub affords the chance to unwind in rose petal-strewn waters before or after the massage.

After having the feet gently cleaned by a hot towel, the treatment begins with a full body, deep-tissue massage.

After about 30 minutes, when the hot press has been given the chance to cool sufficiently so not to cause discomfort, the masseuse applies the press to the body for the remainder of the treatment.

The herbs help to relax the muscles, reduce bruising and swelling, and cleanse the skin, while the heat from the press dilates the arteries, increasing blood flow and oxygen circulation around the body – also helping to soothe tense or aching muscles.

While having a professional masseuse administer a relaxing massage and hot herb press is undoubtedly preferential, it is possible to reproduce the same effect at home.

To create a hot herb press

ou will need to lay your hands on the following ingredients: zingiberaceae (ginger), turmeric, mus), blue gum (eucalyptus),

Each massage room is lit by candle light, creating a soothing, tranquil ambiance.

> lemon grass, sweet flag (calacamphor leaves, croton, leech limes, tamarind leaves and crinum lily.

Preparation

Cut the herbs up into pieces, beat or grind until soft and then combine the ingredients before placing them in a white cloth. Ensure that the press is neither too big or too small, then tie at the top to hold the herbs in place.

Place the press in a steam pot until the press is hot to the touch. Use the palm of the hand to reduce the heat from the press and dip in massage oil before using on the body.

This ensures that the press is smooth and also stops the skin from burning – always a good


Place the press on the body briefly at first until the body adjusts to the heat. Once accustomed to the temperature, you can apply the press to the skin for longer periods.

Benefits

Ginger, turmeric, galangal and lemon grass when heated, stimulate blood flow through the arteries and help to relax the muscles.

The herbs that produce powerful aromas - blue gum. camphor leaves and croton help to relax the mind and calm the nerves.

The herbs that taste sour – tamarind, acacia and leech lime – help to clean the skin removing any bacterial build up that might cause spots and other dermatological conditions.





Skin deep on the cheap

f you are looking for a natural, clear and healthy complexion – and who isn't, darling? – you'll be delighted to hear that not only is it achievable but also you don't need to be splashing the cash on all those expensive skin-care creams or lotions in fancy packaging to make it happen.

Of course, genetics play a part, but to make the most out of what mother nature gave you, it all begins with being careful about what you eat. This is because many of the toxins and other nasties that we consume when we eat processed or junk food are expelled from the body through the skin. Certain foods can have a visibly adverse effect on the skin, with spots erupting as a result of grease build up and rashes from allergic reactions.

The first and cheapest step in helping the skin look fresher is to avoid caffeine, alcohol and sweet drinks. Instead, flush your system by drinking lots of plain water.

Next, start brushing your skin about twice a week, before bathing, to get rid of the layers of dead skin (exfoliation). You can find skin brushes at health and beauty stores and super markets. Use a soft brush so you don't rub your skin raw. Bathe, then be sure to use a moisturizing lotion on your skin afterwards.

The skin is also under constant attack from dust, dirt and cigarette smoke and other airborne pollutants, which kill off collagen. Some skin conditions are hereditary but their symptoms can sometimes be lessened by eliminating or adding certain foods from your diet.

Treatment tips

Rashes and itchy skin.

Chamomile is the herb of choice when seeking to soothe irritation from rashes and itchy skin. You can purchase chamomile lotions from supermarkets, but if unavailable you can use chamomile tea. Make the tea, leave it to cool, and then spray it over the face. Leave for sometime and then rinse.

Wrinkles and signs of aging.

The best method to combat wrinkles is to use a handful of almonds, some orange oil – if you can't find orange oil then use the zest of an orange – and grape seeds. Mix everything together, apply to your face and leave for 10 minutes. The nutrients from the orange oil (or skin), grape seeds and almonds will help to protect your skin from wrinkles and will also get rid of the dead skin.

Pimples. Squeeze two limes, mix the juice with fresh, clean water then spray the "cocktail" over the face. Leave it on for a short time and then wash your face as usual. Citrus fruits such as limes and lemons contain citric acid – one of five Alpha Hydroxy Acids (AHAs) – that help to clear dead skin and kill bacteria, reducing inflammation on the face. With really bad cases of acne you should consult a dermatologist.

Before trying any of these treatments on your face, test them out first on the back of the hand, just to ensure your skin is not allergic to any of the ingredients. Even though all the tips prescribed here use natural ingredients, everybody's skin is different.



stablished in 1907 by Tiaw Guy Hong, the "22 Laminated Forge" was situated between Dibuk and Phuket Roads in Phuket City. The "22" in the name refers to the sum of money – a princely 22 baht – that the founders were required to pay when they opened the forge around the turn of the century.

Chinese workers were being brought in from Tau Pho district in Canton, China to work in the tin mines. Tiaw Guy Hong came to Phuket from China, upon hearing that the island had an urgent need for blacksmiths and were prepared to pay far better wages than he could have hoped for back in his homeland.

At that time Phuket's primary industry was tin mining. To operate, the mines required a substantial amount of steel equipment, much of which had to be manufactured by hand; which accounted for the flourishing smithy industry.

Many of the forges were located in the *Thaew nam* zone

the center for tin mine equipment manufacture on the island. The forges in the zone were also adept at modifying and repairing all manner of equipment.

The number of forges dramatically decreased, firstly as the era of tin mining came to an end and later due to the emergence of high-tech factories capable of mass production. With their economies of scale, the new factories were able to undercut the prices of the old style forges, which gradually began to die out.

In 1979, 22 Laminated Forge relocated to Thepkrasattri road in Thalang district. In order to survive, the forge has had to reinvent itself, targeting its modern day products at the gardening and construction sectors. This strategic adjustment has paid dividends, with orders flooding in. Without any advertising or marketing, the forge now operates flat-out, six days a week, just to meet demand for its range of products. Such is the pressure of the current workload, workers at the forge who were questioned

for this article, had to continue working while they were interviewed.

The forge's three best-selling products are large knives, crowbars – used extensively in the construction industry – and axes. The work space is packed with an assortment of raw materials, waiting to be fashioned into some item or other for one of the company's many customers.

Preecha "Pae Mhee" Tirananuwat is the manager of 22 Laminated Forge. A sprightly 80 years old, he is still going strong. Pae Mhee became a blacksmith when he was 20 years old, having learned his trade from his grandfather, Tiaw Guy Hong, whom he would sit and watch, gradually picking up the process.

Of course, in those days, there was no technology to speak of; just the power and the skill of the blacksmith himself. They had to order materials from Penang, which would arrive by sea aboard three-masted Chinese junks. These days, most of the materials used in the forge come from

Bangkok, while some have to be imported from overseas. Pae Mhee told the *Gazette* he thought that the blacksmith tradition in his family would probably come to an end with this the fourth generation.

"I don't want my two grand-daughters to become black-smiths," he said. "Both of them are still studying and anyway, I don't want to give this job to a woman," he added.

Sixty years ago, there were seven laminated forges in Phuket. Now, the island has only one forge that uses the laminating process. Laminating requires more time and technical expertise than other processes. The forge produces on average 20 products per day, with Pae Mhee still personally checking each piece before it leaves the premises. His two sons both have 20 years' experience but Pae Mhee insists that they can still learn from their father.

The price of the products depends to a large extent on the market price for steel. Sixty years ago, the cheapest product cost a mere two baht. Today it costs between 200 and 300 baht. The most expensive product sold by the forge is a shaman blade, used in Chinese ceremonies and at the Vegetarian Festival. The forge also makes bulk sales to traders, who come to buy up to 50 products at a time with the intention of selling them on. However, despite all this bustling trade, Pae Mhee insists that the current income still hasn't made the four

employees of the forge rich.

Rungsun "Tu" Sitthichoke is one of the forge's established customers. The supervisor of a rubber plantation, he has been buying knives from 22 Laminated Forge for over 10 years.

"I buy big knives for my staff. The quality is very good and the knives are very durable," he told the *Gazette*. "We use them usually until they are lost. Pae Mhee has a very good feel for making knives. He has many styles that are crafted specifically to suit a certain object," he added.

Pae Mhee summed up his life, listing his four proudest accomplishments.

"Firstly I have to say that I am so proud of my laminated process. Second; I never regret having kept the forge open even after the end of the tin mining period, when I switched to making big knives and axes for gardeners. Third, I am proud of having redesigned the cart wheel that was used for transport vehicles in Patong. The carts at that time had very large wheels, which made it difficult for them to negotiate Patong Hill, where the road was really bad. Having studied the issue, I calculated that the problem could be resolved by making the cart wheel smaller.

"Finally, I am always very happy when a customer comes back to tell me that the product he bought from me is of good quality," he concluded.

Paul Moorhouse

Paul Moorhouse is one of Phuket's most successful property developers. He has five major developments to his credit and has been a major player in making Phuket one of the most desirable international locations for upscale villa projects.

Born in Scarborough, Yorkshire, England, Paul's ambition from early life was to be a rock star. He started singing as a choir boy at age 9, and by 17 had headed to London where he did back-up vocals for commercials and joined his first band, *The Mandrakes*. He learned to play the bass and drums, did session work with the *Gary Glitter Band* and was a room mate with the drummer for *David Bowie*'s band.

Though playing with an interesting crowd, Paul soon realized that his chances of making it big in music were remote. But his ambition in life continued to be to make money.

By 1975 he was selling shoes in fashionable Oxford Street in London and had set up his own company, Daisy Roots, which brought London fashion to the more remote, rural regions. At one point, he had seven shops around England.

In 1979, he decided that he wanted to experience corporate life and was hired as Sales Man-

ager for Yorkshire for TNT Transport, a major multinational providing air freight, sea freight and courier services.

"I loved the corporate life. It allowed me to travel and meet really interesting people. I became Sales Manager for the UK in 1981 and by the time I left the company 16 years later, I was the Chief Operating Officer for TNT Worldwide, based in Amsterdam," he says.

From 1983 to 1989, Paul was working out of Singapore as TNT's Director of Sales and Marketing for the Australasia/ Asia Pacific region. This was the period when he first discovered Phuket.

"I came to Phuket in the early 1980s and stayed on Patong Beach because it was then a peaceful and stunning place. I have photos of Patong during those years when there was not a single umbrella on the beach."

By 1995, Paul decided to retire from corporate life. He headed to Phuket to spend a couple years enjoying the island's beauty. He met Don Taylor during this time and the two decided to build a housing estate at the entrance to Laguna Phuket that would provide an international standard of luxury and comfort for the high net worth investor.

Paul gave his ideas for a modern tropical home to a local architect and built 17 Lakeshore Villa homes on 21 rai of land. That project quickly sold out and they moved on to build and sell Lakewood Hills, 19 large hilltop villas north of Laguna Phuket with stunning views over the golf


"By 2004, there were more businesses opening in our area. Don and I believed that a commercial shopping center toward the north of Phuket was needed. We decided to build Plaza del Mar with 36 offices, which were quickly rented. Since then, I designed and built Layan Gardens, 40 apartments on 13 rai. And I'm currently developing ten villas at LUNA Phuket."

Paul now lives in Panwa Gardens, with views over Chalong Bay and the islands of Phang-nga Bay. Set on 2.5 rai surrounded by forest, he has designed a space that provides privacy with a variety of separate buildings, all connected by elegant landscaped tropical gardens, ponds, pathways and waterfalls.

"I'm not planning on more major developments but would rather focus on developing individual properties to bring out their full potential.

Meanwhile, I can keep very busy playing golf, spending time on my Princess motor vessel, or riding around on my Harley Davidson," he says with a smile.



The original "hot-hatch" returns, better than ever



Now this is being followed up by the sixth GTi, even sharper and more confident than all its predecessors.

A GTi whose chassis systems – with standard electronic transverse differential lock – redefines behavior in curves and traction. A 240 km/h fast GTi that is more fun to drive with its powerful 207 bhp (155 kW) turbo engine. The original Golf GTi boasted only 110 bhp, but at the time seemed to be every car lover's dream. Significantly, over the years, the torque output has doubled – from 140 to 280 Nm. The benchmark 0-100 km/h time



is a respectable 6.9 seconds – not out-of-this-world quick, but more than adequate. Bear in mind, though, the original took over nine seconds for the same sprint.

Like the previous model, an optional 6-speed dual clutch transmission (DSG) will be offered with the new GTi as an alternative to the 6-speed manual transmission. The DSG was pioneered and developed in Weissach by Porsche and offers significant advantages, particularly in the area of smooth gear shifts, but also offers better fuel economy. Porsche's incredibly successful 956 and 962C Group C race cars

benefited from this form of transmission.

A dual-clutch effectively offers the function of two gearboxes in one. Think how a conventional gear shift occurs: the driver reduces power, presses the clutch, which disconnects the engine from the gearbox, then selects a new gear before releasing the clutch pedal. It is obvious therefore, that a conventional transmission means that there is not a continuous flow of power from the engine, but torque is activated in an interrupted sequence according to the gear shifts.

The dual-clutch transmis-

sion uses, by definition, two clutches but has no clutch pedal. Sophisticated electronics and hydraulics control the clutches, with one clutch controlling the odd-number gears – first, third, fifth – and the second the even-numbered ratios – second, fourth and sixth. Using this unique system means gears can be changed with no interruption to the power flow from the engine.

For the first time, the distance control system adaptive cruise control (ACC) will be offered on the Golf GTi starting late summer 2009. When ACC is activated, the system automatically

brakes and accelerates the GTi within a speed window from 30 to 210 km/h. Above all, when cruising at a constant speed on the freeway, ACC offers a significant plus in comfort and safety. Distance control is implemented with a laser sensor in the rearview mirror that continually scans the distance to the vehicle in front and its speed using five laser beams.

Another high-end piece of technology on the new Golf GTi is the optional Park Assist park steering assistant. The second generation of the system is used here. It enables nearly automatic back-up parking, parallel to the roadway.

As an option, Volkswagen is offering the Golf GTi with completely redesigned bi-xenon headlights, including dynamic curve lighting. The headlights swivel through a steering radius of up to 13 degrees to the outside and seven degrees to the inside. Other options include 6-disc CD autochanger, power seats, leather upholstery and a tire pressure indicator. The GTi, however, is pretty comprehensively equipped as a standard vehicle.

The German market launch of the sixth GTi took place at the end of March, while sales started across Europe just after Easter. North America and Asia will follow in late summer.

ecent years in India have seen the rise of

The future's bleak, Darling



MONEY TALKS

ritain's Chancellor of the Exchequer, Alistair Darling, tried desperately to spread the blame for the financial crisis and recession as widely as possible. In his pre-budget speech to parliament in late April, he predicted that the UK economy was going to contract by 3.5% in 2009. He also predicted that the economy would start to recover near the end of this year, and growth was predicted in 2010.

This is all in sharp contrast to his predictions in late 2008, when he saw growth of 0.75% for 2009. He also conceded that the economy was facing the worst conditions since before the Second World War. That takes us back at least as far as 1939. The UK economy is going to start growing in late 2009? Why would Alistair Darling be so optimistic? Is it just possible that as an elec-

tion is due to be held by summer 2010 the government is putting "spin" on the figures and outlook?

Unfortunately for Mr Darling, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) chose

the same day to release its latest predictions. The UK economy, in its estimation, will shrink by 4.1% this year, the worst performance in decades. The IMF does not even see any growth in the UK in 2010. These latest estimates from the IMF are more dismal than data from its last report. This is a cause for concern for the global economy. The IMF now predicts that the global economy will contract by 1.3% in 2009; previously the forecast was for anemic growth of 0.5%. The latest figures reveal that, if correct, the global economy will be at its weakest since 1945.

The outlook for Germany has been downgraded to a contraction of 5.6% for 2009, an extremely unpleasant result. In the UK, unemployment has now reached 5.6% and rising; many analysts believe that it will reach

Rising unemployment means lower tax receipts by government, which is also facing reduced revenue from many other sources. The British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) speculated on April 22 that the budget deficit could reach 15% of GDP. Later the same day they felt that 11 - 12% of GDP is a possible

The BBC also mentioned that when the budget deficit reached 9% in 1976 the UK actually had to apply for funding from the IMF. I remember it well; the government of the day blamed it all on the "Gnomes of Zurich", a disparaging term for Swiss bankers. Nobody ever explained then or later how exactly Swiss bankers were supposed to have achieved this result or why they would want to. There is an old political maxim: "to have peace at home, have a war

abroad". Nowadays, the wars can be waged in political rhetoric. Regarding Swiss banks: Union Bank of Switzerland (UBS), the largest, announced that gold could

surge to US\$2,500 an ounce within the next five years. UBS gave several reasons, including that the current economic environment gives central banks "low margin of error". Central banks around the world are attempting to stimulate economies through massive fiscal stimulus packages. But the prospects are likely that



they will either undershoot or overshoot. Undershooting will result in deflation. Overshooting will cause inflation. In the second half of April, gold is in the US\$880s. If UBS is right, investors in gold are going to have a very pleasant experience.

There is also another factor supporting the case for investment in gold - there is an increasingly widespread lack of faith in paper currencies.

The former-chief economist of the IMF was interviewed by the BBC. He believes it is highly likely that central banks in general have not boosted their economies sufficiently, and economic growth, if possible, is some distance away.

It is so important that people realize the severity of the current situation. The IMF predicts that global trade will shrink by 11% this year. The IMF had one reasonable piece of news: Chinese growth should reach 6.5% this year and will accelerate in 2010. This might not be the 8% target of the Chinese government, but it is not too far short.

Reports from Japan and other regional economies refer to increased demand from China. So far in 2009. China has become the world's biggest market for motor vehicles; the US is second.

China has made it clear that it does not have an endless appetite for US dollars; diversification into gold is already taking place.

Bloomberg announced in late April that exchange-traded funds (ETFs) had bought 469 tons of gold in the first three months of 2009. One group of futures fund managers, Superfund, introduced a new concept: gold as the actual currency of the fund. The fund trades in a very large number of areas, such as energy, interest rates, precious metals, commodities, stock indices and currencies.

One important factor with futures funds is their ability to invest either "long" or "short" in any area of interest. Superfund uses emotionless trading; performance is the best measure of all. Their Superfund Gold A (SPC) was formed in October 2005 and it made a profit of 17.53% by year end. In 2006, +32.92%; in 2007, +19.28%; in 2008, +32.29%; and in 2009 to end March, +1.69%.

Another important point that Superfund makes in its investment briefings is that futures funds can reduce a whole portfolio's volatility and increase profits. Certainly, investors in this fund have had a very profitable journey. The newer version of this fund also has identical management techniques but removes the front-end charge.

Superfund has offices in many of the world's major cities and was established in the mid-1990s in Austria.

Idealists turned dictators



he stories of Fidel Castro and Che Guevara have been told many times before. An epic two-part movie about the latter has been recently released and follows a previous film called The Motorcycle Diaries about the young Guevara's radicalizing travels through South America. Now comes Simon Reid-Henry's Fidel & Che (Sceptre, London, 2009, 467pp). Subtitled "A Revolutionary Friendship", this is a well-researched though woodenly written dual biography of the two revolutionaries.

Both grew up well-to-do, Castro in eastern Cuba, Guevara in Buenos Aires. Castro became a lawyer, Guevara a doctor. Castro was a charismatic stem-winding orator with a steady following.

Guevara was a loner, a dreamer, fond of poetry and philosophy. He got involved in communist politics in Guatemala before meeting Fidel and Raul Castro in Mexico City. They had just been released from prison for their attempted takeover of a military barracks in Santiago, Cuba, and were plotting their return. Guevara threw his lot in with them. Half of the book is about the young, idealistic, romantic phase of the Cuban revolution, the other about the years afterward, as Cuba slid into Stalinist dictatorship.

The story of the three-year fight in the jungled mountains to overthrow the dictator Batista is a rousing one:

"The first rebel columns moved into Havana. People clambered up street lamps, or stood atop their Plymouths and Chevrolets, to see them. They were jubilant scenes. Pistols fired off victory reports among the crowds that thronged the streets, cheering wildly, if just a little bit nervously as well.

"As they sat on the cusp of a new phase in their lives, one whose dimensions they could not yet begin to fathom, Fidel Castro in Santiago and Che Guevara in Havana had little time to reflect on the fact that the war was over. But it had forged a bond between them that was as deeply ingrained as the dirt on their clothes and the adrenaline in their veins."

The heroic guerrilla fighters who had endured hunger and constant fear, facing the armed might of the American-equipped army, now had a whole country to run. Castro was 32, Guevara 30.

Early in his career as a guerrilla commander, Guevara had to shoot an informant. Now he had to shoot a great many more while the prisons bulged with dissidents and the press was muzzled. Castro began giving his legendary eight-hour speeches. Guevara toured the world as the face of the Cuban revolution and led the country into the embrace of the Soviet Union. Castro was at first more circumspect, but on the eve of the Bay of Pigs invasion, which he personally repulsed, threw himself into the

Still, as this book reveals, he kept open a back channel means of communication with the White House through a female television journalist, Lisa Howard, who charmed and was charmed by Castro. This secret line of communication was severed with the assassination of John F. Ken-nedy. Lyndon Johnson wanted nothing to do with Castro


Guevara and Castro

gradually grew apart as Guevara embarked on a course of worldwide revolution, first in Africa and then in Bolivia.

The end was sad, the martyr half-dead of exhaustion and hunger. Castro lives on, having driven millions into exile and beggaring the rest.

"But, in fact, Guevara lives on because of how he became Che in relation to Fidel Castro and because it is ultimately in their relationship with others that individuals must

be judged," Reid-Henry writes. "It was Aristotle who said that friendship could be based on one of three things: utility, pleasure or goodness. But it was only the latter, Aristotle said, that was lasting. Fidel and Che were not the greatest of friends in any conventional sense of the term, but their friendship was based



upon a distinctly modern version of this latter notion of goodness: goodness understood as the common good, what is perhaps better known as solidarity."

This book is afflicted with a good many boring pages, especially towards the end, but the story carries the reader on relentlessly. It is one of the great

oogle Translate, a machine translation tool from everyone's favorite search engine company, has recently added support for the Thai language, plus six more. This brings the total up to 41 languages, with the capability to translate between any two of them. You can either

cut-and-paste text or feed it a URL to have it translate entire pages.

The accuracy of machine translation improves the more data Google has, usually in the form of bilingual corpora. So expect the results to be a huge grab bag for now, but also expect them to get better over time.

Notice that after you paste text to be translated, there's a link on the bottom right of the results page inviting you to "Suggest a better translation". This is great, because it harvests human knowledge to augment the machine translation.

The simple phrase ผมชื่อสมชาย returned "I named Somchai", so I

suggested "My name is Somchai" instead. Piece of cake. Then I tried อกิสิทธ์ เวษษาชีวะ (knowing it would likely translate it literally). It returned "Prerogative physician Charles existence". So I suggested "Abhisit Vejjajiva".

I've never really explored all the features of Google Translate, since I don't really know any of the languages it has hitherto supported. Exploring it now with Thai, though, they have another really cool feature: Translated Search. It's your basic cross-language information retrieval. You search in your native language, specify the target language, and it returns pages in that language about the thing you searched.

For example, if you want to find Thai websites about Thai history (for, say, the images), search "Thai history", with Thai as the target language. It returns pages like the Thai Wikipedia entry on Thai history, with the first few lines in both languages. You can then click through to see the whole page translated, or view it in the original language. Ouite handy.

Unfortunately, these new tools suffer from the same problem that Thai searching in regular Google does: tone marker blindness. Type 171 "tea"

into Google Translate and you get "slow" (which is actually spelled ชา), type ดิน "squirm" and it returns "soil" (actually ดิน), ไหม "silk" returns "burn" (actually ใหม), and so forth. It's a problem.

Mob rules again in Phuket

Just days after Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva's government finally managed to restore order to Bangkok, mob militancy was back on the streets of Thailand. This time, it was closer to home. Protesters blockaded Srisoonthorn Road in Baan Bang Tao for almost 24 hours, causing disruption for both residents of the island and the tourists so crucial to its economy.

Such protests are all too familiar to island residents. In mid-March, a similar blockade took place in Kamala. Villagers there, angry that a man charged with a brutal assault was granted police bail, took to the streets and blockaded the Kamala-Patong Road for 20 hours.

At the beginning of February, the Laguna Phuket resort complex was blockaded by disgruntled staff for three days.

And in early January protesters blockaded the entrance to Sirinath Marine National Park in Sakoo for three days, trapping some tourists' cars inside the park for the duration.

Any consideration of such protests can hardly ignore the yellow and red elephants in the room. Late last August, yellow-shirted members of the People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) forced a complete shutdown of Phuket International Airport.

Prime Minister Abhisit owes his position in large part to this kind of militancy, following the shutdown of Suvarnabhumi and Don Mueang Airports and the occupation of Government House by the PAD protesters last year.

Despite the clear illegality of these actions and the inestimable damage they caused, the PAD leaders have not been held accountable, at least by the courts. This makes it hard to avoid the conclusion that in Thailand, people power – or mob rule – does work.

This message was clearly not lost on Thaksin Shinawatra's red-shirted supporters, who earlier this month wreaked havoc in Bangkok and Pattaya.

In Phuket, street protests are typically directed at local police. One protester, Voravuth Maneesri, believes "people power" is the only weapon he has to force the authorities to listen to him. [See First Person, page 23]. There is, after all, no real equivalent of the UK's Independent Police Complaints Commission (IPCC) in Thailand.

It would perhaps be naïve to call for the immediate establishment of an effective police complaints body in the image of the IPCC, but without such effective mechanisms in place there appears to be no end in sight to street protests, which in a well-functioning society are a matter of absolute last resort – not a knee-jerk reaction.

With no sign of protest action going away, nationally or locally, Thailand's international reputation, and consequently its prosperity, will continue to suffer.

Kathu Road

Late last year there was a letter sent to you by a concerned resident of Kathu. It was written with regard to the deteriorating road surface between the British International School and the village of Kathu, specifically behind the Loch Palm Golf Course.

As I recall there was a follow up by the Gazette with the Mayor of Kathu who promised to have the road resurfaced by December of 2008.

The road is once again in such a state of disrepair that I have written the following letter to the governor in the hope of receiving a more definitive answer as to when the road really will be fixed.

"Dear Governor Wichai:

I am a resident of Phuket and own a home at Baan Suan Loch Palm, Kathu. The reason for this letter is to ask you to please investigate the condition of the road between the British International School and the village of Kathu.

Late last year a letter was sent to the Phuket Gazette by a concerned resident of this area wondering why this road had been neglected for so long. The Gazette investigated and the Mayor of Kathu told the reporter that the road would be resurfaced by December 2008.

To date, there has been little done and I am extremely worried that there will be a serious accident or worse, a fatality due to the condition of the road.

Drivers are swerving all over the road to avoid the potholes. I am sure you will agree that this is very dangerous. I have lived here for several years and I travel all over the island. I take my daughter to the new international school in Thalang everyday and have noticed that some of the roads – which in my humble opinion did not require attention – have been resurfaced.

I believe the road in ques tion is in much greater need of repair.

I would appreciate it if you could look into this matter for me and the many residents of Kathu who share the same concerns. We are all very worried for the safety of all who travel on this road and also the undue wear and tear on all our vehicles.

All I have is people power

ob protests aren't in fashion, though some people might think so because they're happening all over Thailand now. If you lived in my area and knew what's happening here and why we're doing this then you might have a different view of us. We're doing this because we're unhappy with the authorities. They don't take people's problems seriously. And unless their asses are on fire, they don't move. So the people have to put pressure on them to make them

If we hadn't blockaded the road, do you think they'd have found the boy's body as quickly as they did? The police didn't even know where the murderer was. Why did they tell us that they checked the CCTV and didn't see the car pass through Tah Chat Chai checkpoint? The killer said that he left Phuket through Tah Chat Chai. Does that mean that the police didn't have the CCTV on? How can we believe them?

From my point of view this isn't just about one boy dying.

This kind of story keeps happening and the police never catch anyone. Then they come and tell me that if they can't do their job then the chief will leave. What's that all about? Do I buy it? No. One hundred chiefs can leave. I don't care, because the superintendent will become superintendent elsewhere, and then what? If you leave your job as governor here but then take up a job as governor somewhere else, does it make any difference? If they told me that if they failed to do their job properly they would quit and never take a similar job again, then I might buy it.

We're not simply copying the red and yellow shirts. I'd been thinking of doing this for a long time, but we were patient until this incident. This was the last straw. Do you know how many incidents have happened before this? One happened just beside the police station recently. We talked to the police about it and the superintendent said that if he couldn't catch the murderer he would transfer himself. He did move, but only because they were going to move him anyway.

And who takes responsibility? No-one. My nephew was murdered in a different case to the one I just referred to. And there was another murder near my house.

I can't say that our protests will solve our problems, but the authorities will be aware of what their responsibilities are. They should work for us. We're letting them know we're watching them. We're not going to be silent anymore. Why should you need people pressuring you? You're not a chisel that needs to be pushed to make it work. Catching people who aren't wearing helmets or seat belts isn't the only job the police have.

Mob protests aren't a good thing. Phuket survives on tourism and protests like this don't help. Thailand doesn't look good in the eyes of foreigners right now. But if you think about it, you'll all get benefits from this too. If you come to Thailand and something happens to you, who will you ask for help if you can't rely on the authorities? If they do their duty quickly and properly, you'll benefit from what we've done.

I'm aware of the consequences of the protests and I'm sorry about making people suffer. I tell everyone to be polite and explain to people who have to use the road why we are here.

That day many Thais and foreigners weren't happy, but I asked them, if something serious happened to you and the authorities ignored you, who would you turn to? So I asked them to bear with us. The sky is always blue after the rain.

Sometimes when people get together to accomplish something their aims can diverge and they can become hard to control. That's why I make sure there's no alcohol in my protest. A big group of young men isn't easy to control and that can cause more problems.

After our protest, the police and the authorities did their duty, so we had no right to continue the blockade. We're not social evildoers. We made our point and things have moved forward. They got the murderer. There's no point making innocent people suffer for no reason.

We're not putting mob rule

over the law. I just want to see the right thing done and I don't have any better way to pressurize the authorities and the police to make them work – all I have is people power. And the only way we have to exercise it is to close the road. If you say, "why don't you close the police station instead?", I'd say we could do that but all we'd get from it would be a lot of pointless standing around, while the police just sit in the air conditioning drinking coffee. They'll keep telling us they'll come and talk to us in two hours' time. We won't get anything from doing that, but if we close the road we'll inconvenience a lot of people and the message will get through - then we'll get recogni-

We are really sorry. We didn't want to cause more trouble for Thailand. But if we don't force the police to act, what can we do? The police just hope that people will eventually forget, so they can get away with it. And I just want to say to the people out there and to the tourists, if you were in our shoes, what would you do when this happened to your family?

Legal age for driving license

Is there an official age for a person to legally obtain a motorcycle/car license in Thailand? There does not seem to be any police control of what appears to be unlicensed young people riding motorcycles. Furthermore, if you are involved in an accident with a motorcycle/vehicle ridden or driven by an unlicensed person, how do you claim for any damages to either personnel or to your vehicle?

Mr Charote Klinmanee, Chief of Registration Department, Phuket Land Transport replies:

You must be 18 years old to drive a car in Thailand and you must be 15 years old to ride a motorcycle. Some of the young people you refer to will not have a motorcycle license. If you are involved in an accident with someone who is riding without a license, then they will be deemed guilty of unlicensed driving and will have to pay a fine.

You can claim for any damages through their insurance, although if they are unlicensed it is unlikely they will have any. If this is the case, then they will have to pay you themselves.

Sea Dragons suffer second home defeat

huket FC's poor home form continued as they crashed to a second consecutive defeat, this time losing 4-3 to high-flying Nakhon Sri Thammarat.

In only their third match, Phuket are showing signs that they can hold their own in the division and will be disappointed not to have come away with at least a point from an entertaining match.

Marathon runners given a mountain to climb

he Phuket Mountain Marathon returns on May 3rd with runners being asked to tackle a grueling 42.1 kilometer course up hills so steep, some motorbikes struggle to climb them.

The marathon starts at Nai Harn beach at 3.30am on Sunday morning. From there, runners head to Sai Yuan village, along to the three-beach view point and over to Kata and Karon Beaches. The competitors will then head over to Karon circle, Big Fan (Turbo generator), Yanui Beach, the Promthep Cape, Rawai Beach and then finally down hill for the final three kilometers back to Nai Harn.

Merely completing such a challenging route is an achievement in itself, but organizers are also giving away prize money totaling 187,500 baht. The first man to complete the marathon will take home 15,000 baht, while the first woman over the line will receive 10,000 baht. The top 15 men and top 10 women will also receive cash prizes.

For those not quite up to the challenge of a full marathon, there is also a half marathon consisting of a mere 21.1k run beginning at 5am, a 10.55k minimarathon starting at 6am, a 5k Fun Run starting at 6.10am and a 5k family run starting at 6.20am.



Going Green

s discussed in the pre vious column, I will, in the weeks ahead, focus on some of the most cost-effective environmentally-friendly technologies available.

GeoExchange (Geothermal) heating and cooling systems are the most energy-efficient, environmentally clean, and cost-effective environment conditioning systems available according to the Environmental Protection Agency.

GeoExchange – also known as Ground Source Heat Pump (GSHP) – represents a revolutionary technology for heating and cooling buildings using the ground as a source of energy. This is the "next generation" energy solution.

Compared with solar photovoltaic panels, which are 14% efficient or wind turbines at 48%, GeoExchange can approach or exceed 400% efficiency.

Why? It requires less energy when moving heat from one place to another and is more efficient than a combustion furnace converting one kind of energy into another.

In heating mode, an efficient GeoExchange system will move at least three units of solar energy from the ground for each unit of electricity used by the heat pump and its accessories.

In Thailand, GeoExchange would be used for its cooling capacity in air conditioning and in the production of sanitary water.

Our vision is to provide information, creating public awareness, offering everyone the possibility of using it at home, in schools, and in public buildings, including hotels.

The result would be developed areas without noisy compressors. Imagine for a moment living in your Phuket home without all the noisy machinery and yet still having a cool and com-

fortable environment.

GeoExchange technology would eliminate the horrible mess on top of hotels, normally a jungle of spoiled pipes and rusty compressors. Proud owners and tourist operators could show visitors that they are doing something for the environment and save money too.

Switching to renewable energy, however, can be an awkward process, requiring considerable cultural belief and substantial financial resources. Most people – managers, decision makers, politicians – grudgingly accept the fact that the climate is changing. Traditional energy sources are being progressively extinguished as the price of oil becomes more and more unpredictable.

The question must be asked, why has Thailand not embraced this technology when the rest of the world is welcoming it with open arms?

Nearly all conventional residential and light commercial buildings use refrigerant type air conditioning systems for cooling the interior space. These units all have the familiar outdoor condenser units. Variations include packaged heating/cooling units and air source heat pumps. All use outside air to cool the refrigerant, while expelling heat into the surrounding air.

The manufacturers of that outside equipment are quick to post impressive EER and SEER numbers (efficiency indicators) on their "high efficiency" models, but a closer examination shows that these lofty numbers do not correlate well under realistic installation conditions. The outside condenser is working under stress because the external temperature is changing during the day and night. The higher the outside temperature, the poorer the performance and subsequently, the more electricity used. External temperature, dirt and debris and the aggressiveness of salt from the sea combine to drastically reduce efficiency.

The performance of an appropriately designed GeoExchange system is independent of changes in outside air temperature and humidity. The temperature of the earth where the GeoExchange occurs remains relatively unchanged throughout the year meaning that GSHP's efficiency for both heating and cooling seasons is fixed.

From a building design perspective, GeoExchange systems allow greater architectural flexibility. Rooftops do not need to be flat to support massive cooling towers and all hardware is located indoors to protect it from the weather and vandalism.

Installation costs have come down substantially in recent years. They are expected to continue to fall as more builders and contractors offer GeoExchange

systems. The industry is developing innovative ways to install the systems faster and more efficiently.

GeoExchange systems are a sound investment. The amount they can potentially save the home owner in energy costs every month is more than enough to offset their high installation costs. Furthermore, the energy efficiency of the system adds value to the home. It is estimated that a home's value increases by \$10 to \$25 for every \$1 reduction in utility bills.

This aspect is relevant in a place like Phuket where the property business is one of the most important on the island.

A Gazette "Property Watch" article in December 2008 said, "A year ago, most CRE directors believed that improving energy efficiency and reducing carbonemissions would cost money, at least in the short run".


After reading the entire article and the result of the included survey, the impression given was that most developers are convinced that by merely acquiring more green land they will increase the sustainability of their property and develop closer ties to the environment.

We believe this is due to a lack of information about renewable sources of energy. The improved technology can be applied both in new and refurbished buildings.



The early bird sometimes catches the worm

A look at the advantages of buying a home off-plan

espite the global economic crisis and conituing uncertainty about political stability in Thailand, numerous property developments have been recently launched. The majority of the developers offer units 'off-plan', for sale at an early stage in the project development, even before the first brick has been laid.

Some may not be familiar with the term 'off-plan'. Generally speaking, buying off-plan means buying units which exist only on the drawing board and where construction of the project may not even have started.

Off-plan sales are offered by developers because they often need to sell their product quickly, so they price units extremely low in order to achieve fast and valuable finance, enabling them to proceed with the construction of their develop-

Purchasing an off-plan unit may have considerable advantages compared with investing in an already complete project. 'Early bird' buyers can often benefit from significantly lower prices

- something that makes an offplan purchase extremely interesting from an investment point of view – as such units may rise in value during the construction, even prior to their completion.

Smart payment plans, typically a minor deposit payment, followed by a 30% first instalment and a high final payment upon title transfer, allow buyers to effectively secure a high-value asset for a relatively low initial capital

Furthermore, a purchase in the early stages of a project ensures that buyers can choose the best located units in order to satisfy their individual requirements and those of future buyers with regard to a re-sale.

Buying off-plan also offers the chance to 'flip' a unit prior to title transfer by way of assignment of the buyer's rights under his sale and purchase agreement, which allows investors to save transfer fees and taxes occuring from title transfer.

In brief, off-plan investment can create a win-win situation for the buyer and seller. Buyers can obtain a low price for a quality

product with a high resale value and sellers are able to secure fast project finance.

However, in order to ensure the security of your investment, comprehensive due diligence should be carried out to minimize risks and to protect you from a worst-case scenario: total loss of your invested funds. Such due diligence should always be conducted by a reliable and reputated law firm, whose subsequent appointment of additional experts, such as surveyors, might be recommendable, depending on individual requirements.

Due diligence is also important, particularly when buying a property off-plan, as a number of extremely important points, such as secured access, lawful title to the project's land as well as a correctly formulated application for any required construction permits or licenses may not have been accomplished, completed or sufficiently verified by a developer.


Additionally, the financial stability of a developer offering an off-plan sale should always be of concern. In this respect, the utmost attention should be paid to the reliability and track record of a developer.

A professional real estate agent representing only reputable developers, ideally having the financial backing of big investors, can be the first benchmark to seperate the wheat from the chaff.

To summarize, an off-plan purchase can result in an interesting and promising investment. In all instances, however, extensive market research, awareness of potential risk, comprehensive due diligence, as well as consideration of generally accepted risk management is of paramount importance in securing the right product, which is not only a bargain but which also satisfies your personal criteria for a safe invest-



Start makin' sense

Building your own incense stand

he item described and pictured here is a simple stand I built for my wife on which she burns incense on Buddhist holidays – it would also be perfect for a flowerpot. When I build larger, heavier shelves, I always use diagonal cross bracing which is important for strength and rigidity. However, I "cheated" here, doing without – at first glance – the di-

agonals for three reasons.

The first is that the item is built to hold a very lightweight item - a single clay saucer containing about two inches of sand that safely holds the burning incense sticks. All the joints were nevertheless

nevertheless "glued-n'-screwed" for rigidity, as glued joints cannot move.

The second is that the lower cross braces are wide (tall) enough to be attached with two screws set vertically about an inch apart, providing the same effect as a diagonal brace. Parallel movement of the legs cannot occur when secured by braces with two anchoring points

he item described and perpendicular to the direction of movement.

The third reason is that the legs are not parallel, being slightly wider at the base than the top. This was done because firstly a 'tapered' design is more attractive, and secondly because legs joined like this are more stable. The different sized cross braces keep the legs from parallel-tilting since the distance between the

anchoring points would change. If the legs were parallel and the braces the same size, this would not be the case. I'll discuss diagonal cross bracing – the only practical use for high-school geometry I've ever found -

much further in a future column.

This stand was built from odd pieces I had in my workroom, so there is a slight difference in some of their dimensions. We had moved into this house just a few days before that year's Song-kran holiday – also my wife's birthday! I wanted to finish it in time for her to use that day, so I just used what I had. The legs are 31" high; the 'wide' side's bottom braces

are 13" long, the upper braces 12" long; the 'narrow' side's bottom braces are 12" and the upper ones 11". The pieces that make up the "platform" are 11" x 2 3/4". Sharp-eyed readers will notice that the upper brace on one side is below the top platform, while the other side is flush. This is because the stand was made from recycled wood, and two of the pieces had small nails broken off in their edges. To compensate, I lowered the brace to keep the screws from hitting the nails.

Tip: it is very helpful to use two drills. I keep the drill bit in one and the (usually Phillips) magnetized screwdriver bit in the other. This eliminates constant bit changing. It also makes it easy to start and run screws into predrilled holes with one hand while holding the work with the other.

To assemble this stand, lay the leg pieces for one of the sides face (flat) down on the floor and position the cross braces. Be sure to pencil mark the braces' positions. Hold the braces in position and drill your holes. Place a piece of scrap plywood underneath to save your bit from contacting the floor. Apply some glue, then reposition the pieces and run the screws in, stopping when the heads just barely contact the wood. Where pieces were joined flat-side to flat-side, I used #14 x 3/4" pan-head screws, and later ground off any protruding tips. Build the other side the same way.

Now take the "narrow side" cross braces, and drill screw holes near their edges. Then, lift one "side" onto its side, position the cross brace and drill through the brace's hole into the edge of the leg while the side assembly is secure against the floor. Repeat with the other side. Be careful drilling into the edge, as you must drill perfectly straight. Where pieces were joined flat-side to edge, I used #14 x 1" screws.

Next, apply some glue and attach both narrow side braces to one side's leg as you hold it against the floor. Then, position

the other side beneath the ends of the cross braces, and attach. This is where pre-drilled holes come in handy. Again, stop your drill when the screw heads just barely contact the wood.

Turn the assembly around and attach the other narrow side's braces the same way. Now, place the stand upright and flex the corners until all the legs' tips touch the floor evenly. Then grip each joint securely as you finish tightening the screws by hand, trying not to move it as you seat the screws.

Measure across the width of your top "platform", and cut the pieces to fit with a little overhang. Then center one piece at a time on the top, and looking down on it, pencil mark where the holes should be. Lay each piece on the scrap of plywood, and drill. Then, reposition on the platform, and drill through the holes into the cross braces. Remove them, apply some glue, reposition them and run the screws in. Weatherproof it with varnish or polyurethane.

That's it! Have a beer! See you next time.
