

Criminal cowards

Teenage thieves attack helpless blind woman

TWO heartless teenagers attacked and robbed a helpless blind woman in Phuket City on Friday night, stealing her handbag, her room keys and her two mobile phones.

Because she is blind, masseuse Wilawan Maikong, 43, relies heavily on her telephone.

It is her only way of telling the time, and is a vital lifeline in a sightless world.

The 'baby bandits' struck just after 7.30pm while Ms Wilawan was sitting on a concrete bench outside the Nong Neuy traditional Thai massage parlour in Phuket Villa 1.

A youth, described as 'a skinny teenager wearing a red shirt and shorts', ran up to Ms Wilawan, grabbed her handbag and raced off to where an accomplice was waiting on a motorbike.

The pair then sped off in the direction of Yaowarat Road.

The handbag contained Ms Wilawan's two mobile phones, a phone charger and her room keys.

Fortunately, her money was money," he said.

safely inside the massage parlour.

This is not the first time criminals have hit the massage parlour which employs seven blind or visually impaired people.

In previous attacks, a motorcycle has been stolen, a phone booth has been vandalised, and ten pairs of shoes have been taken from outside the parlour.

Ms Wiliwan, who comes from Lamphun province in northern Thailand, moved to Phuket five years ago after completing a course in Thai massage, sponsored by the Association for The Blind in Chiang Mai. She earns only about 5,000 baht a month.

Phuket police Captain Kittiphum Thinthalang said cowardly thieves often preyed on the disabled.

"They attack elderly and disabled people as well as pregnant women," he said.

"They ride around town looking for easy targets."

Captain Kittiphum said he felt sorry for Ms Wilipan.

"Like most disabled people, she works very hard for her money," he said.

Sea gypsy families will rise from the ashes

THE central government has promised to build temporary housing for the 17 sea gypsy families whose homes were destroyed by fire last week.

Social Development and Human Security Minister Issara Somchai visited what remains of the Ban Hin Look Diow sea gypsy village on Saturday and presented each of the families with supplies including rice, palm oil and cooking equipment, as well as 3,000 baht in cash.

He said the families would also be given temporary homes costing about 120,000 baht each.

Mr Issara encouraged the

sea gypsies, whose homes tend to be little more than seaside shacks, to build more permanent accommodation in the future under the Social Development and Human Security Ministry's Stable Homes project.

Under the terms of the project, the sea gypsies would

have to form a co-operative and take out a government loan to build homes under a long-term lease agreement.

Boonchuey Varee, whose home was destroyed in the blaze, said that in the short term the community members' first priority was just to get shelter.



THE 77-foot yacht the Chrysalis-T, which was left floundering on the sands of Maya Bay last month after the yacht owner's 21-year-old son ran it aground during a joy-sail with friends, was successfully refloated on June 30. The US\$2 million yacht was taken to the Boat Lagoon and is now out of the water so that repairs to the damaged rudder and scarred hull can be carried out. The cost of the repairs has yet to be determined.

Swine flu kills student

A UNIVERSITY student who died of pneumonia at Vachira Phuket Hospital last Thursday was infected with the A(H1N1) virus that causes swine flu, lab results have confirmed.

Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) chief Dr Pongsawas Ratanasang said the student was a 19-year-old in his first year of the engineering program at Prince of Songkla University (PSU) Phuket campus.

He was a native of Phattalung province.

The lab results were released by the government-run Phuket Medical Science Center in Thalang on Monday, Dr Pongsawas said.

Like most other people who have succumbed to the virus in Thailand, the boy had a pre-existing medical condition.

His mother said he was 'chronically ill'.

He had also recently been treated in a hospital in Haad Yai for a broken leg, the cast for which was removed just a few weeks ago.

These factors may have weakened his immune system and made him vulnerable to the virus, the mortality rate for which is less than 0.5 per cent of those who are infected.

The cause of death was listed as a second-

ary bacterial infection in the boy's lungs.

Three roommates who shared an apartment with the teenage swine flu victim have been ordered to report daily to the Phuket Provincial Health Office.

After four days, none had tested positive for A(H1N1).

Dr Pongsawas said this was the only case of A(H1N1) infection reported at PSU.

An investigation into the student's death suggests he may have contracted the virus at a nightclub, he said.

The boy died at about 3pm on Thursday after a four-hour effort by doctors to treat him with antiviral drugs and a respirator failed.

The student had visited a private hospital early last week complaining of a slight fever.

He was given medication and a follow-up appointment was made.

At 1pm on Thursday, friends found him in his dorm room. He was conscious but extremely lethargic and was having difficulty breathing.

The friends rushed him to Vachira Phuket Hospital, but doctors were unable to save him.

Chikungunya outbreak worsens

WHILE much attention is on the number of cases remains much fight against the spread of swine flu in Phuket, the island is still suffering from a chikungunya outbreak and has the highest per capita infection rate of any province in Thailand.

According to recently released figures from the Phuket Public Health Office (PPHO), there have been 2,155 confirmed cases of the disease in the province in the first half of this year – with no deaths.

PPHO Director Dr Pongsawas Ratanasang said 98.6% of the victims were Thai, with 31 cases reported among foreigners.

Most of the foreign sufferers were low-wage Burmese laborers, whose work and substandard living conditions put them at risk of being bitten by the Aedes mosquito that spreads the virus that causes the disease.

Statistically, Phuket had an overall incidence rate of 669 reported cases per 100,000 people for the first half of 2009.

The province thus ranks first in the country, although the higher in the lower south, where the outbreak originated.

Dr Pongsawas also noted the high incidence rate for Phuket is skewed by Phuket's huge unregistered population of migrant workers from other parts of Thailand as well as Burma.

The incidence rate is calculated as the number of reported cases divided by the registered population, which is less than half of the actual number of people on the island according to most estimates.

However, chikungunya cases often go unreported as many sufferers do not seek medical attention from hospitals, but from private clinics or simply by treating themselves with non-prescription drugs.

In a breakdown by district, Thalang had the highest incidence rate overall followed by Kathu and Muang Districts.

Within Thalang, tambon Srisoonthorn had the highest incidence in June followed by Thepkrasattri, Pa Khlok, Cherng Talay and Sakoo.

A statistical breakdown by month reveals the outbreak has become much worse in the province in recent months. In March and April the incidence rate was less than two cases per 100,000, but jumped dramatically in May (297/100,000) and again in June (1,352/100,000).

The PPHO has adopted a 'blitz' campaign in its efforts to rid the island of the disease by using a variety of measures, including disease control and prevention units at district and tambon levels.

The units are tasked with collecting statistical data to track the spread of the outbreak, organizing preventative measures such as spraying mosquito breeding sites, and raising public awareness about how to avoid mosquito bites. They also advise people about the steps to take if they do contract the disease.

The public relations effort is being conducted in tandem with steps to control the spread of the A(H1N1) virus that causes swine flu.

Woman killed by truck



A YOUNG woman died instantly on Tuesday afternoon when a pickup truck slammed into her motorbike as she tried to cross the busy Thepkrasattri Road.

Sirintip Jongjalern, 26, was on her way home from work at the Blue Canyon golf course when she pulled onto Thepkrasattri Road in Thalang and into the path of a fast-moving Toyota Hilux pickup.

The driver, Sophon Janlap, 22, was unable to avoid slamming into her, and Ms Sirintip died instantly of head injuries.

The pickup then careered into an electricity pole.

The pickup was extensively damaged and Mr Sophon fled the scene.

Miss Sirintip's body was hurled 20 meters away from her bike.

Mr Sophon, who later surrendered himself at Thalang Police Station, has been charged with causing death by dangerous driving.







Protestors demand police action

ABOUT 200 people protested outside the Kathu Police Station on Wednesday, charging officers there with failing to keep their word by not stopping work on a private real estate project at the south end of Patong.

The protesters blocked off a section of Ratchapatananusorn Road, which runs in front of Kathu Police Station.

Many of the protestors are fishermen who keep longtail boats along the banks of Klong Pakbang, and who wanted to vent their frustration at police for not stopping construction work on the project, located in the Klong Pakbang area.

The project, which will cover 112 rai, is being developed by the Belair Marina Park High Company on what the protestors claim is part of a mangrove forest project initiated by Her Majesty Queen Sirikt.

The company has already started building a 2.5-meter concrete retaining wall which runs for about 500 meters along the banks of the canal, which is the main drainage canal for most of Patong.

Protest leaders included party-list MP Chalermluck Kebsup of the Democrat Party and Somkiet Kuru, a local politician who failed to defeat Mayor Pian Keesin in the last Patong Municipal election.

The protesters first set up a tent at the project site on Monday, complaining that the project was being built on public land for which two chanote title deeds were illegally issued many years ago.

The land, the largest remaining large tract of undeveloped land near Patong Beach, was originally set to be developed by the Martello Holdings company as the 'Malina Marina project', which failed to eventuate.

Several years ago, Phuket Municipality hired its own consultants to draw up a development plan to buy back the land and develop it as a recreational area which would include public walkways, tie-up areas for longtail boats and 'Gam Ling' (monkey cheeks) lagoons which would minimize flooding in Patong.

Recently, the Belair Marina Park High Company started work on its project and filled in large sections of the canal. The company claims it has legal title to more than 30 rai, but the protestors claim the land is public land which was to be used for HM Queen Sirikit's mangrove project.

On Monday, more than a hundred protestors met with Vice Governor Smith Palawatvichai to discuss what they claim is an encroachment onto public land.

No one from the company was at the meeting.

Vice Governor Smith told the protestors that if a construction company having land title deeds was harming the environment or causing trouble for local communities, it would lose its title deeds. He advised the villagers to 'calm down and follow the regulations'.

On Monday afternoon the protestors officially reported the encroachment to police and demanded they order the company to stop work immediately. The company appeared to agree, but as soon as the police left, construction work resumed.

One protestor, Somkiet Kuru, said the Belair Marina Park High Company had two title deeds, numbered 1501 and 1974, to 112 rai of public land.

Summer storm deluge leaves Patong under water

Employers rush to register illegal workers

FOLLOWING a Cabinet decision, employers of unregistered foreign laborers from Burma, Cambodia and Laos have been given a 30-day grace period until July 30 to register them with both the Phuket Provincial Employment Office and Immigration. After that a crackdown is promised, with unregistered workers facing deportation and their employers fines and arrests. The Gazette's Tipwarintron Tanaakarachod and Atchaa Khamlo report.

THE period for new alien worker registrations – and the impending crackdown – were announced during a seminar at the Phuket Merlin Hotel last Thursday.

The event was attended by the heads of the Royal Thai Navy Third Command, the Phuket Employment Office and Phuket Immigration as well as representatives of provincial fishery associations.

The issue of unregistered foreigners working illegally in the Andaman coast fishing industry was the main topic of discussion.

In the only exception to the deadline, Rear Admiral Sarayut Deangthed said unregistered fishing boat crew aboard vessels already at sea would be given an extra 60 days to comply.

There are an estimated 3.5 million foreign laborers in Thailand, with 200,000 in Phuket issuing new work cards to illegal alone, he said.

Despite the large figure, just 768 illegal workers were apprehended in Andaman waters between January and April, according to Navy statistics.

Third Naval Area Commander Vice Admiral Narong Thedvisal said a recent 10-day inspection of fishing vessels in local waters showed only 300 out of 1000 foreign crew members were legally registered.

Many foreigners take advance money from employers to work on fishing boats and then escape to go and work in different professions or in other provinces, he said.

He promised that the Navy will prosecute all violators – both crew members and those who employ them – after the grace period runs out.

The task of registering and aliens in Phuket falls to the

Phuket Employment Office, which requires all employees to report foreign staff. It is not possible for foreign workers to register by themselves.

In the past, there was a quota system by province and no new worker registrations have been accepted in recent years.

This led to a massive increase in the number of foreign workers, especially from Burma, and the emergence of a lucrative trade in smuggling illegal Burmese workers into Thailand.

The extent of the problem came under the international spotlight in April last year, when 54 Burmese bound for construction jobs in Phuket suffocated in the back of a truck.

Recognizing the scale of the problem, the Cabinet finally passed a resolution allowing more unregistered workers from three countries - Burma, Cambodia and Laos – to obtain work cards.

Phuket Employment Office chief Thanawan Tongsukchote said employers must first report to the Employment Office between July 1 and 30 and report the number of workers they currently have – or wish to employ.

Then, the employers have until August 14 to get health clearance certificates issued by hospitals registered with the Public Health Ministry. After this they have until August 29 to submit applications and pay a 3,880 baht fee for each worker.

The entire process can be completed in just four days if all the paperwork is in order, Mr Thanawan said.

Only workers from Burma, Cambodia and Laos are eligible for the pink alien worker's cards, which will remain valid until the end of February, 2010. After that, workers are eligible to extend them annually for a maximum of two years.

Workers from other countries – including Nepalese and stateless Rohingya refugees from Western Burma - are not included.

They must go through the same process as other foreigners and be issued a work permit in order to work legally.

Applicants from those countries claiming to be from Burma, Cambodia or Laos face deportation under immigration law, he said.

The back of each worker card is color-coded according to

the six work categories: fishing (blue), domestic servants (gray), agricultural and livestock (green), construction (yellow), fishprocessing (orange) and 'others' (pink).

Almost all are low-paid jobs that Thai workers 'are unwilling to do', he said.

"We hope as many employers as possible will take advantage of the registration period, because if they don't, they will face trouble for employing illegal aliens when the grace period ends," said Mr Thanawan.

In cases where the number of foreign workers available is less than required, the government will liaise with governments of the three countries to try and address the shortfall.

In some cases, this effort would include helping foreign workers to obtain the required travel documents from their home countries, he added.

Once in possession of work cards, foreign workers would be allowed to legally travel to and from their own countries through Immigration checkpoints – a luxury they currently don't enjoy.

Once the grace period is up, the task of deporting workers caught working illegally in the country will fall to Phuket Immigration.

Phuket Immigration Superintendent Chanatpol Yongbunjerd estimates there are currently about 70,000 alien workers from the three countries in Phuket.


To register with Immigration, workers need to submit photos of each employee together with copies of the employer's house registration forms and ID cards.


"The government has said this will be the last chance for employers to register new workers under their administration," Col Chanatpol said.

Asked about the Immigration status of scores of ethnic Nepalese working as touts in places like Patong, Col Chantpol said that if his office received any reports of foreigners working illegally in the country they would be arrested and deported.

Their employers would also face arrest, he added.

Killer jumbo takes three more lives

TRANG: An elephant killed three people after breaking its chains and going on a rampage in Palian District.

The 35-year-old elephant, named Phang Natalie, killed four other people only last month.

Police received a report at 2am last Wednesday that an elephant had attacked a man in tambon Laem Som.

At the scene police found the body of 44-year-old rubber tapper Sophon Jinala who had been trampled to death.

Sophon's wife, 39-year-old Od Jinala, told police she went to tap rubber about 500 meters from the house, leaving her husband at home to care for their grandchild.

While she was working, she heard her neighbor cry out that an elephant was coming, and she ran back to the house, but Mr Sophon was not there.

At first she thought her husband had probably gone to help capture the beast, but a short while later, a neighbour found his body.

Not long after that, police received a report of two more deaths.

In Tambon Thung Yao, rubber tapper Priya Mekchai, 51, was trampled to death while out working with her daughter, who was able to flee in time.

Another rubber tapper, 38year-old Jintana Changkhao, whose surname translates as 'white elephant' was killed by Phang Natalie while out working with her husband.

The elephant's owner, 55year-old Somchok Chuban, is a member of Laem Som Tambon Administration Organization.

He bought Phang Natalie around six months ago in Nakhon Sri Thammarat for 620,000 baht.

The elephant's former owner told him that Phang Natalie had previously gone on a rampage, killing three villagers, and on June 9 this year, she became angry and stomped on her new owner's elder brother, Jamnan Chunban, killing him.

Phang Natalie's death toll now stands at seven.

Mr Somchok said he didn't know how Phang Natalie had escaped.

The elephant was recaptured and chained to a tree about three kilometres from the village.

Mr Somchok said he would sell Phang Natalie and pay compensation to the families of the victims.

Police would not say whether any criminal charges would be brought against Mr Somchok.

Surat Thani cops nab suitcase bomber

SURAT THANI: Police have arrested a man suspected of planting a bomb in Kanchanadit district in mid-March, after five bombs were found and defused by Surat Thani Police over a twoday period.

Ranong native Sirichat Khongphan, 44, was arrested at his wife's home in Chumphon on Friday.

Upper South Police Commissioner, Santhan Chaiyanon, said Mr Sirichat admitted planting a bomb under a Democrat Party billboard near the party's office in Kanchanadit, but denied any involvement in the four bombs planted in Muang District.

Mr Sirichat told police he planted the bomb to repay a debt of gratitude to someone.

He said he did not know what was in the case he was asked to place beneath the sign, but he suspected it was not something good.

After being charged for planting an explosive device, Mr Sirithep asked for police protection, claiming others involved in the plot might try to have him killed to silence him.

Abbot claims black magic nailed him

UTARADIT: A temple abbot has been admitted to hospital after doctors found nails in his stomach for the second time in two months.

Phra Athikananuwat Wisutho, 32, abbot of Wat Hat Song Khwai in Tha Pla District, was admitted to Utaradit Hospital last Tuesday after an X-ray found five 3- to 4-inch nails in his stomach.

The director of Utaradit Hospital, Dr Thianchai Khorayothin, said doctors were hoping the nails would pass through the monk's intestines naturally, avoiding the need for surgery.

The nails are not the first unusual foreign objects to appear in Phra Athikananuwat's stomach this year.

Two months ago, Phra Athikananuwat was admitted to Utaradit Hospital after an X-ray revealed two two-inch nails and a pin in his intestines.

Doctors surgically removed the objects and the monk was allowed to resume his duties at the temple.

Phra Athikananuwat said he did not swallow the nails and that he believed black magic had made them appear in his stomach.

But his doctors are convinced that the abbot deliberately swallowed the nails.

Aquatic escape foiled by rescuers

CHONBURI: A drunken Englishman plucked from the sea off Pattaya during the early hours of Sunday was trying to 'swim away' from a hefty bar bill.

Gary William Donovan, 41, was picked up by rescuers in a dinghy at about 1.30am as he was floating about 200 metres off Central Pattaya Beach.

Saijai Khongsomsong, the 39-year-old owner of a beer bar on Soi Pattaya 8, said Mr Donovan had been drinking in her bar since about 8pm.

At the end of the evening, Mr Donovan left the bar without paying his 1,155 baht bar bill, she said.

A staff member followed Mr Donovan and asked him to pay up, but rather than hand over the money, Mr Donovan attempted to escape. He ran onto the beach and dived into the water.

He swam about 200 meters out to sea, where he was eventually picked up by the rescue team, who handed him over to police.

Child killed by stray bullet

NONG KHAI: A police Senior in Nong Khai. Sergeant Major has been arrested for manslaughter after a bullet he fired allegedly hit and killed a 12-year-old boy on Saturday.

The young victim, Saranyu Chaisan, was playing outside his house in Muang District about midday when he was hit in the head by a bullet.

He was taken to Udon Thani Hospital, but died of his injury.

Police arrested and charged Senior Sergeant Major Pathomchai Sukkhaya, 44, with the shooting, although he denies any involvement.

Saranyu's aunt, 41-year-old Sumantha Wirasak, said Pathomchai had been arguing with his wife all that morning, and about noon, a pick-up truck pulled up outside the policeman's house and two people got out.

A short while later, she heard Pathomchai shouting foul language at the pair.

She said Pathomchai shot at the truck as it drove away and one of the bullets hit her nephew.

The two men in the truck were later identified as Chaianand Suwanapaksa and Khampha Bunthawee, debt collectors for a motorcycle dealer

They told police they had gone to the house to collect a 200 baht instalment that Phatomchai's wife owed for her motorbike.

When they arrived, Pathomchai and his wife were having a fierce argument.

When the debt collectors told Pathomchai they were there to collect a payment, he became angry and abused his wife for adding to their debts.

They said Pathomchai shouted at them to get out of the house and shot at them three times as they drove away.

Chakat Thianwong, Deputy Superintendent of the Nong Khai Muang District Police, said Pathomchai denied responsibility and refused to make a statement about the incident.

Bullet casings found at Pathomchai's house match those of the bullet that killed Saranyu, he said.

The 12-year-old's death follows the death of 13-year-old Yotsiri Thamma-satuek, who was killed when a stray bullet fell through the roof while he was having a swimming lesson in Phetchaburi province three weeks ago.

BANGKOK: A Bangkok duty free shop has hit back at a British couple who claim they were arrested and falsely accused of shoplifting at Suvarnabhumi airport and forced to pay £8,000 (approximately 450,000 baht) in bribes to secure their release.

Stephen Ingram, 49, and Xi Lin, 45, from Cambridge, were detained by security guards as they waited to board a Qantas flight to London on the night of April 25.

They claim they were falsely accused of stealing a Givenchy wallet worth 6800 baht from a King Power duty-free shop and arrested.

According to the Times Online website, the couple said they spent five days locked up in a cheap 'love hotel' near the air-

They said they were released only after they handed over the £8,000 bribe money to a fixer named Sunil 'Tony' Rathnayaka, a Sri Lankan national who works as a volunteer interpreter for Thailand's Tourist Police.

After they paid the 'bribe', the couple said they were given an official release order giving them permission to leave the country.

The King Power chain of duty free shops this week released CCTV footage purporting to show Xi Lin putting the wallet into her handbag.

The company also released an official statement detailing its side of the story.

The statement, which is signed by the company's group managing director, Sombat Dechapanichkul, said sales staff noticed the wallet was missing after the couple had been browsing in their shop.

They alerted security staff who looked at the CCTV footage, which 'clearly captured Xi Lin placing the Givenchy wallet into her handbag and exiting the shop without paying for the item', the statement said.

Mr Sombat said security staff went looking for the couple and found them sitting at separate tables in an airport restaurant.

They were now wearing different clothing, he said.

According to the statement, when airport police approached Xi Lin and asked to search her, Mr Ingram got up and went to a block of toilets.

Security staff followed him and found the stolen wallet in a bin near the toilet entrance.

Meanwhile, the British media have picked up the story and run with it, claiming the 'scam' is widespread and that hundreds of 'innocent' tourists have been ripped off.

Stephen Ingram denies the video clip implicates him and is suing for one million baht for wrongful arrest and imprisonment.







Asarnha Bucha

huket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop attended a Buddhist merit-making ceremony at Wichit Sankharaam Temple on Suthat Road, on Tuesday. The ceremony was held to mark Asarnha Bucha Day, which commemorates the Lord Buddha's first sermon.

The governor and about 500 others took part in the traditional ceremony, which involved circling a chedi at the temple three times before placing an offering of flowers, incense and candles on an altar.

The two-hour ceremony began at 8.30am.

Many of those taking part were government-school students on a three-day holiday which began on Monday.

Asarnha Bucha Day is an official government holiday in Thailand, as was *Khao Pansa* Day, the first day of Buddhist Lent, on Wednesday.

The province asked all bars and nightclubs on the island not to sell alcohol.



Butterflies fly to freedom

hao Phra Thaeo National Park in Pa Khlok came alive with color on Saturday when 1,000 butterflies were released into the forest. Phuket Butterfly Garden and Insect World (PBGIW) supplied 15 different species of butterfly for the annual event.

Included were the wonderfully named great mormon, common mormon, tailed jay, lime butterfly, lemon emigrant, leopard lacewing, autumn leaf, orange oakleaf, great egg-fly, clipper, great orange tip, plain tiger, dark blue tiger, common tiger and common glassy tiger.

The event was designed to increase the number of butterflies in the forest and to teach local people how to prevent butterflies from dying out.

Officers from Phuket Provincial Administration Organization, Khao Phra Thaeo National Park, Thalang Police, Thepkrasattri Municipality and other government departments took part.

"The numbers of butterflies in Phuket is decreasing, and we have already lost some species," Wasin Koysiripong, managing director of PBGIW said.

Ms Wasin said some species of butterflies were dying out because construction projects were destroying their habitats.

"Construction workers are destroying the places where butterflies lay their eggs and the plants they feed on," she said

A rich tapas-try of delights



he very mention of the word tapas invokes happy memories from my child hood and early adulthood: summer and Christmas holidays in Spain, long summers spent working in Greece.

I was privy to these opportunities largely thanks to my half-Spanish uncle.

He was a godsend given that I was raised in deepest, darkest North Yorkshire, where most people thought cosmopolitan was a fancy type of ice cream.

The notion of anything foreign was met with suspicion.

"Helmsley born, Helmsley bred, Helmsley life, Helmsley dead," was the locals' expression - frightening.

In Spain, the family would head out late in the evening for food and, more often than not, we would take great pleasure in ordering a number of tapas dishes that we could share. Calamari, olives, cured meats, prawns in garlic, bread, cheese to name but a few. All very exotic for a young lad.

As the night went on the adults would enjoy more than a few glasses of the local plonk while my brother and I would continue to eat and eat and eat, determined to sample everything on the menu.

Getting older, heading to Greece for the summer as an adult gave me a chance to relive those lost summer nights, this time with my colleagues.

There are few differences between many of the dishes in Greece and Spain, but the food took on a whole new lease of life with the addition of a few glasses of good wine.

Now all the pieces were in place - the moonlit sky, the friends, the meal and a hearty bottle of red – heaven.

Good food and a couple of nice glasses of wine, two of life's simple pleasures.

On the first Friday of every month, the Vanilla Sky bar at Cape Sienna hosts a wine and tapas evening which includes free-flow hot and cold tapas and four glasses of wine - two white options and two red.

The open-air design of Vanilla Sky overlooks the Andaman Sea and affords beautiful views of the sun setting at the end of another day in Phuket.

The tapas itself starts at 6pm, giving diners the chance to catch the sun dipping below

As the sky darkens, the candlelit tables create an intimate ambiance and it is easy to sit back, close your eyes and relax, imagining that you are sitting at a quaint taverna somewhere in the Iberian peninsula as a cool breeze rolls in from the sea.

A great place to take a date or share a meal with friends.

The food is served for four hours until 10pm and is a fusion of cuisines, rather than the traditional Spanish fare.

Given the success of the night, despite still being in its infancy, the service can be a tad on the slow side. Diners should expect more of a steady trickle of dishes rather than a rampaging Niagara Falls.

The occasional wait for your food, however, doesn't put a dampener on the night by any stretch of the imagination.

Once seated and comfortable, the staff will offer you a glass of the selected wines, on this occasion an Argentinian Mosaico Chardonnay-Chenin and Shiraz Malbec, and a Chilean PasTao del Sol Sauvignon Blanc and Cabernet Sauvignon.

Selecting the Sauvignon Blanc, I then plumped to start with the selection of cold tapas dishes - Parma ham and avocado roll, tuna and noodle sushi, Caprese skewer and spiced gazpacho soup.

The Parma ham and avocado made a delicious salty-sweet combination, while the spicy gazpacho was complemented well by the tangy and dry Chil-

After a couple of servings of the cold offerings, it was time to make the switch to the hot tapas accompanied by a glass of full-bodied Cabernet Sauvignon.



This time round we were treated to Thai fish cakes with a superb onion and chili jam, seafood wontons with balsamic and garlic puree, beef yakitori with ponzu sauce, chicken quesadillas and fritto of tomato and mozzarella.

The beef yakitori was the stand out dish. Tender and full of flavor, it was a wonderful partner for the smooth red.

Unfortunately, I wasn't able to make my four glasses of wine last the night. However, a Cape Sienna resident's card affords its holders a 20% discount on drinks, so a bottle of house wine became a very affordable 880 baht.

The meal itself was just 699 baht net which, including four glasses of wine, represents tre-



Email: rx@abbysan.com. he Warrior III posture is an intensified continuation of the Warrior I position previously demonstrated in this column in May. When you begin yoga exercises, you might find your thoughts are preoccupied with all that you have done or have yet to do, and your body is not quite as supple as you had anticipated

Fortunately, yoga allows for transition time. Most practices begin with an opening phase of gentle yet thorough movements to awaken the body, stoke the breath and cultivate the attention.

Good poses facilitate circulation and lead you into your sequences with ease. They address the major joints and large muscle groups, gently awakening the arms, shoulders, legs and hips.

Technique

- 1. Start with the downward-facing dog pose.
- 2. Inhale and bring one leg forward, placing it just beside the respective palm. Now align the knee over the ankle.
- 3. Inhale again and lift the back leg up to the level of the hip, parallel to the ground. Straighten the front leg and shift your entire body weight onto the front leg. Gently lift the pad of the palms, coming over the finger tips. Lift the chest up, and look slightly forward and down with a fixed gaze. Now stay strong through the front leg and maintain the vertical alignment of hip, knee and ankle by pressing your foot strongly on the ground. Maintain this position for a few breaths.
- 4. Inhale and walk the hands one step forward, trying to lift the chest further with arms and fingers interlaced to keep the torso parallel to the floor. Breathe evenly in the pose while balancing. The body (except the front leg) should be kept parallel to the floor. The front leg, which should be fully stretched and stiff, should be kept perpendicular to the floor. Pull the back of the thigh of your front leg and stretch the arms and the back leg as if two persons are pulling you from either end, maintaining a perfect 'T' shape.
- 5. Release the back foot down first and place the hands by the side of the front foot. Step back to downward-facing dog and repeat with the other leg. After completing the position on both sides, relax in the child pose.

Benefits

This pose improves your balance, harmony and poise. It also strengthens the leg muscles and is especially good for runners as it gives vigor and agility. The pose also tones the abdominal organs.

Cautions

For people with hyper-extended and knocked knees, or bow-legged practitioners, please micro-bend the knees to avoid further injuries and recruit all the muscles of the leg. It is recommended that you practice this pose under the supervision of your yoga teacher.

Tsownding all the right notes

Bill Page has been delighting readers in the *Phuket Gazette* and other major newspapers in Thailand since his arrival in the Kingdom more than 20 years ago.

Using the pen name S. Tsow, Bill uses humor to provide insights into his view of the world.

He tackles everything from global politics to the sex politics played out by the often naive Westerner attempting to find his place in Thai paradise.

While he has spent most of his professional life improving the English language skills of students in countries as diverse as Taiwan, Iran and Luxembourg, it wasn't until Bill arrived to work at Thammasat University in 1986 that he found his home.

"Why did it take 48 years for me to discover this place?", was his initial response to the new life he found in Thailand.

He has since contributed numerous humor and travel articles for the *Bangkok Post*, over 300 columns for *The Nation Weekend*, has been published in the *Phuket Gazette* as a feature columnist since 1998 and in the



meantime, has found the time to write three books.

The Nirvana Experiments and Other Tales of Asia was published in 1995 by White Lotus Press. This first book is a collection of stories based on Bill's travels around Asia.

The stories are moral metaphors about fate and the human condition.

He is not averse to using tales of magic and myth which often control the lives of the people Bill finds in remote mountain regions around Southern and Eastern Asia.

Asia Books published *Thai Lite* in 2000, a collection of his essays, with *Thai Lite* 2 following in 2005.

"As a young man, I was interested in religion and the spiritual life of man. I think I might have a genetic disposition to religious eccentricity inherited from my ancestors who left England for America to practice their form of Christianity," Bill says.


The young Bill graduated from Bowdoin College in Maine, USA, in 1960 after completing his studies of philosophy and English. At the time there was a draft for the US military and he decided to enlist so he could choose a course of study.

As he had a talent for languages, he was offered the choice of Russian, Arabic or Chinese for a US Army security program. He chose Chinese, which set him on his future path in Asia.

After an intensive 48-week course in Mandarin, Bill was posted to Taiwan where he spent much of the next 10 years, first with the US military and later teaching at the Taipei American School.

"During my early years in Asia, I pursued the study of the *Vedanta*, the core religion found in India. I spent decades reading various religious texts including the Upanishads, which has helped me to understand the nature of existence," Bill reveals.

In his pieces, Bill has taken

his serious study and turned it to telling stories full of human compassion and humor.

The people in his stories are often those facing moral or physical dilemmas that they either overcome or transcend.

Bill spent a couple of years working in community development in a small village without electricity in northeastern Nepal during which time he learned to read and write Nepali.

A major change of direction came when he decided to work in Isfahan, the beautiful but religiously conservative heart of Islam in Iran.


He went to work in Iran in 1975 and stayed until the Shah was deposed four years later when Bill was evacuated.

For the next few years, Bill taught in Luxembourg and then took a lucrative job in Saudi Arabia writing training programs.

The posting to Saudi Arabia gave him the opportunity to take travel breaks. By 1986, he was ready for life in Thailand.

"The two great passions of my life have been the study of religion and the pursuit of women," Bill smiles.

"After a few holidays in

Thailand, I decided to combine my two main interests and accepted a job at Thammasat University," he adds.

During the past 20 years, he has been able to pursue his study of religion by taking trips to Tibet, Afghanistan, China, India and Nepal.

His extensive studies and his travels have brought him to the conclusion that "anybody who takes anything seriously in this world does not understand the situation". Bill will be reading a selection of works at a 'Writer's Night' on July 16 at the celebrated Mom Tri's Boathouse.

become managing editor of the Phuket Gazette, he had already worked in the international media for over 25 years.

"I believe I was the first career journalist hired by the Gazette, which I think gave me a more finely tuned sense of who the readers were and an ability to recognize stories that were useful, informative, educational and entertaining."

Back in 1999, the *Phuket* Gazette was published every two weeks. Under Alasdair's tenure, it expanded to a weekly community newspaper.

"The *Gazette* already had a well established identity when I arrived, but it was very much an expat paper, concentrating on the activities of the expat community. There was little focus on Thai society or how the local government functions.

"I pushed hard to educate readers about local politics, about immigration rules and procedures and other important issues, such as land ownership. I worked to give the readers a deeper insight into the stories behind the news."

Alasdair began his career in the media as a young reporter for the community newspaper Cheshire Weekly, in his home town in England. He started as a

By the time Alasdair Forbes reporter and over the next six years moved to become the paper's district news editor. In 1977, he moved to the Chronicle Group, but a sense of adventure led him to accept a job in Saudi Arabia as sub-editor for the Saudi Gazette.

> "I learned a tremendous amount working in Saudi Arabia as many of the staff came from major international newspapers like the Daily Express."

> By 1980, Alasdair was appointed chief sub-editor of the Gulf Mirror, a weekly newspaper in Bahrain. Two years later he was hired as production editor by Al Hilal Publishing, which produced trade magazines for the shipping and construction industry. He was based first in Bahrain and then Cyprus.

> In 1988, he moved to Hong Kong to work at Asian Business.

"I stayed at Asian Business magazine for eleven years, starting as production editor, and eventually became Associate Publisher. This is where I learned about keeping magazines afloat. I traveled around East Asia negotiating contracts with media companies. I loved living and working in Hong Kong on the edge of the New Territories."

But the 1997 financial crisis was traumatic for Asian Business magazine and eventually Alasdair decided to look at Thailand as a new place to use his considerable media skills.


"Working in Thailand has been particularly delightful due to the openness of local Thai society and the willingness of most people, regardless of their position or status, to receive me and talk candidly. In the Middle East, it was very rare that one got to speak with the powerful and influential. In Hong Kong, people were generally less forthcoming with lots of 'no comment' answers to questions."

Alasdair stayed with the Phuket Gazette for seven years, guiding his reporters on how to find the facts behind a story. By 2006, he thought it time to diversify his interests. He bought a ten-rai fruit farm on the island and is now the general manager of Forbes Communications, a free-lance and editing agency which provides editorial services for the Internet and print media. This new lifestyle gives him more time to spend with his wife Pen and their dogs.

"Now that I have more control over what I can do with my time, I'm able to get more involved with the community. I'm a board member-elect of the Phuket Community Foundation which has developed a toy library program for local schools and a number of road safety programs."





The mystical Luang Por Cham from the memoirs of Prince Damrong

AT Chaithararam, more commonly referred to as Chalong Temple, is one of the most important temples in Phuket.

Comprising beautiful chapels and elaborately decorated pagodas, Chalong Temple draws many visitors and Buddhist devotees every day who come to pay their respects.

The temple owes its popularity to a famous monk named Luang por Cham, who served as its abbot during the late 19th Century.

Today Luang Por Cham is respected and revered not just in Phuket but throughout the region.

During the reign of HM King Chulalongkorn (Rama V), Prince Damrong Rajanuphab, the King's brother, was assigned to head the Ministry of Interior.

The prince, an expert Siamese historian, wrote many books during his lifetime, inluding his memoirs which recalled his first official visit to Phuket where he met the famous Phra-Kru Visut-Wongsajarn, Luang Por Cham.

King Chulalongkorn's reign saw the establishment of a new political system which greatly weakened the powerful nobles and centralized administrative power with the royal family.

After the reforms, most of the important positions once held by the old league of nobles were

AT Chaithararam, assigned to royal princes, most more commonly of whom were the King's referred to as own brothers.

Prince Damrong was given control of the Mahathai, the Ministry of Interior, which was one of the most important posts in the Kingdom.

Six towns on the Andaman coast, including Phuket, were also placed under the jurisdiction of the Mahathai, which meant Prince Damrong directly supervised the governors of the six towns, including Phuket.

According to his memoirs, Prince Damrong visited Phuket several times when he was head of the Mahathai, and during his first official visit to the island in 1898, the prince heard stories about a revered monk who was the abbot of a temple near the village of Ban Chalong, and possessed mystical powers.

The prince visited Chalong Templeand met the abbot.

In his memoirs, Prince Damrong wrote that Phra Kru Cham was both wise and humble and estimated he must have been around 60 years old.

The prince noticed the monk's ankle was covered with gold leaves, something he found most peculiar.

The practice of sticking gold leaves on Buddha images and relics is an old tradition with Buddhist devotees, but to worship a living being in this manner was unheard of.

Curious, the prince asked Luang Por Cham about the gold leaves on his ankle, and the abbot smiled and explained that whenever he traveled through the town or villages to collect alms, people would pay their respects by attaching gold leaves to his body.

According to his accounts, the legend of Luang Por Cham started many years before when a fishing boat left port and headed out to sea where it encountered a powerful storm which mercilessly tossed the small vessel about violently, threatening to tear the boat apart.

The terrified fishermen were helpless, and they prayed to the gods and deities they worshiped, but to no avail.

When no amount of pleading seemed to help, one of the crew members remembered Luang Por Cham, who possessed supernatural powers.

He prayed that if the abbot could save his life and prevent him from drowning at sea, he would visit Chalong Temple when he returned to shore and pay his respects to the abbot by sticking a

gold leaf on the abbot's body.

The custom of asking a deity for help and promising to do some deed in return is not uncommon among Thai people, but praying and asking a living being for divine intervention is unusual.

But, legend has it, at that instant, the storm s calmed and eventually died down, leaving the boat and its crew unharmed.

When the fisherman returned to port he kept his promise and went to Chalong Temple awhere he asked to see Luang Por Cham.

He told the abbot the entire story and asked for permission to place a gold leaf on his body.

At first the abbot was reluctant because he felt it was improper, but the grateful fisherman insisted, arguing that if he did not fulfill the promise he made, he might suffer the karmic consequences later as a result.

The abbot finally agreed.

After the seemingly miraculous event, word spread throughout the many large and small communities of Phuket Island about the holy powers of the abbot of Chalong Temple.

Many peoplecame to pay their respects and prayed to the abbot for favors, promising to come back and stick a gold leaf on his body if their prayers were answered.

The sick would pray to him for health, while merchants would pray to him for success in their respective businesses.


Often the faithful townspeople had their wishes granted and they would return to place a gold leaf on Luang Por Cham's body.

Thus the rare custom of sticking gold leaves on a living being was practiced on the famous abbot throughout his lifetime.

Even today, visitors to Chalong Temple still continue the practice of placing gold leaves on an image of the abbot who is still held in the highest regard by the people of Phuket.

Luang Por Cham is not just respected and revered for his believed abilities to perform miracles. When he was abbot during the Chinese angyi rebellion against the Siamese authorities, Chalong Temple became a rallying point for the villagers to defend themselves against the rebels.

Preparing for life after death

xpats are a very diverse community and the expat population is currently increasing at a rapid rate.

Many are on short-term contracts, intending to return to their country of origin or another 'high tax' jurisdiction.

When it comes to financial planning, things are completely different for the long-term expat. They tend to have loose links with their country of origin.

In many cases, expats are able to enjoy a higher standard of living than they would in their home country, due to being able to legally avoid much of the taxation applicable to others.

Problems can arise for the expat's financial plan in the event of death, which places family members in a difficult position.

Expats usually realize the importance of a good education for the next generation, combined with the need to maintain reasonable standard of living for loved ones. The simplest way to rule from the grave is to use a trust.

Those who have encountered trusts will probably have found them to be inflexible, rulebound entities with little practical use. Most trusts are this way because of one factor: tax.

Revenue departments the world over are determined that trusts are not misused for tax

To ensure that trusts fit their accepted mould, anyone creating one must effectively part company with the trust's assets and – to a great degree – control of the investment management.

However, remove the tax authorities and trusts become altogether different entities. In this situation trusts become useful everyday vehicles.

Expats have the ability to choose what are commonly known as offshore trusts. To many, the words sound like entering dangerous waters, but the reality is quite the opposite.

Expats enjoy many advantages, trusts being just one. By being able to legally access the offshore world, they are able to use trusts in a totally different

Take these two cases. One is a resident in a high-tax jurisdiction who creates a trust to look after the welfare and education of two minors in event of his death. The other is an expat who does exactly the same.

The difference is that if the resident does not die while his children are minors, the assets of the trust cannot be reverted to the resident without a substantial tax liability.

The expat is able to use an offshore trust which allows complete control of the funds inside. In addition, if the expat lives into his children's adulthood, it is possible to withdraw all the assets tax free.

What is a trust? A trust is a legal entity that can hold assets of any investable commodity cash, bonds, shares, property; it can even own companies. In theory a trust can be used as a

trading vehicle. But most trustees will resist involvement in what are known as "trading trusts". The reason for this is simply because trustees do not want to be liable for losses in a trading environment.

Where it is necessary for a trading situation to be included in a trust, usually the trustees will simply place the trading area in a company, giving it limited liability which can be owned by the trust.

The person setting up a trust is known as a settlor. The trust usually comes into full operation following the death of the settlor. The trustees are guided after the death by a letter of wishes.

This document takes the place of a will in the trust and sets out the settlor's intentions, including any limitations. For example, the trustees might be asked to ensure that minors have their living expenses, school fees and medical expenses taken care of. Upon reaching adulthood they may have access to the capital.

Alternatively, a beneficiary may have a fixed date to inherit the capital, say, at age 30.

Not all beneficiaries of trusts are children – they can be elderly relatives or a surviving

Settlors of trusts can, and often do, take into account the behavioral patterns of a beneficiary. For example, a surviving spouse may be a spendthrift and the trustees will only release sufficient funds to provide a reasonable lifestyle, seeking to avoid overspending.

Where a spendthrift surviving spouse has minors, it may be necessary for school fees to be paid directly to the school. Minors in this case can include children who have reached adulthood but are attending university.

Offshore trusts used properly can ensure that a breadwinner's untimely death does not lead to ruin for the surviving family. All situations are different but most trust deeds are broad enough to encompass various scenarios.

It is the wording of the letter of wishes that is all-important.

Settlors of trusts that have been established offshore have another option. They can appoint a protector. The protector is someone the settlor knows well. Maybe an adviser, such as an accountant or lawyer, a competent friend or family member. The key reason for including a protector is usually to guide the trustees.

It is important to remember that where a protector has been appointed, the trustees may not act without the consent of the protector.

The settlor can also be a protector. In the normal running of the trust, the settlor's powers automatically include those of the protector.

For various reasons, settlors may wish to disband an offshore trust. This is usually because the children have become adults. Removing assets from an offshore trust simply requires a request to do so.

The aforementioned relates to the most common of offshore trusts: the discretionary offshore trust. There are other types of trusts which, even when held offshore, are less flexible, but they are uncommon.



once had high hopes for P.J. O'Rourke. Tom Wolfe was the great New Journalist of the 1960s and Hunter S. Thompson took the Gonzo crown in the 1970s.

They were succeeded by P.J. O'Rourke's great globe-trotting journalism of the 1980s in *Holidays in Hell* and *Republican Party Reptile*. Wolfe went on to write skinny polemics and fat novels, the last of which was nearly unreadable.

Thompson drowned in his own fame and excesses and never wrote anything decent in the last two decades of his life.

O'Rourke took to comfortable political pontificating in books like *The CEO of the Sofa* and *On the Wealth of Nations*. But now, the bad boy is back.

His new book *Driving Like Crazy* (Atlantic Monthly Press, New York, 2009, 258pp) is a collection of old and new pieces of "automotive journalism", pieces he wrote over three decades for various car magazines. I've dipped my toe in this genre myself, road testing over various weekends a Triumph 900cc Thunderbird on Khao San and a Cherokee Jeep in the wilds of Kanchanaburi.

You get to have a great time, plus write a story and get paid for it. O'Rourke plied this trade with a vengeance, going off on racing and endurance jaunts in Baja California, the Pacific Northwest, cross country from Florida to California, across Pakistan and India on the Grand Trunk Road to Calcutta, and even over the mountains of Uzbekistan. All kinds of disasters happen to him which makes his stories, of course, all that more hilarious for the reader.

His introduction is a rousing diatribe against what he calls the "Fun-Suckers", people who don't want you to drink, smoke, drive fast, hunt, eat junk food and emit hydrocarbons.

"The Fun-Suckers go around saying how unsafe this fun thing is and how unhealthy that fun thing is and how unfair, unjust, uncaring, insensitive, divisive, contagious, and fattening every other thing that's fun is... The Fun-Suckers are a bit too careful, a bit too concerned, a bit too scrupulous. That's bullshit. They're evil and they hate us. The motive behind spoiling things for others and then throwing a wet blanket over the rained-on parade is a latter of neither caution nor morals. The Fun-Suckers suck the fun out of life in order to gain control."

His first chapter, appropriately enough, is a paean to the joys of drunk driving published in the National Lampoon in 1978.

"Even more important than being drunk, however, is having the right car. You have to get a car that handles really well. This is extremely important, and there's a lot of debate on this subject – about what kind of car handles best. Some say a front-engined car; some say a rear-engined car. I say a rented car. Nothing handles better than a rented car. You can go faster, turn corners sharper... You can also park without looking, and you can use the trunk as an ice chest. Another thing about a rented car is that it's an all-terrain vehicle. Mud, snow, water, woods – you can take a rented car anywhere. True, you can't always get it back, but that's not your problem, is it?"

Finally, he whips himself up into a paroxysm of patriotism in describing his first giddy exposure to NASCAR racing in Charlotte, North Carolina:

"The South is what we've had all along in this bizarre, slightly troubling, basically wonderful country – fun, danger, real friendliness, energy, enthusiasm, and brave, crazy, tough people. After all, America is where the toughest crazy people on the planet came to do anything they damn pleased... Put us all together and we're the biggest, baddest, best sons of bitches anywhere, and the hell with foreign countries because that's where all the sane wimps stayed."

Thieves give us a bad name

Just weeks after the furore in the Australian media over the Phuket authorities' treatment of Melbourne mother of four - and now convicted thief - Annice Smoel, the Western media is back on the offensive against Thai justice.

This time, it's the turn of the British.

The Sunday Times carried a report last week claiming a British couple were the victims of an extortion scam at Suvarnabhumi airport.

The article reported – as fact – that Stephen Ingram, 49, and Xi Lin, 45, 'were falsely accused of shoplifting in Bangkok airport and were forced to pay £8,000 in bribes to secure their release'.

The couple were accused of stealing a Givenchy wallet worth 6,800 baht from a King Power duty-free shop and arrested.

They deny any wrongdoing and are threatening legal action for compensation.

But King Power is fighting back. The duty free retailer has uploaded CCTV footage of the incident to its website which appears to show Xi Lin putting an item in her handbag and leaving the shop.

For those who have seen it, the conclusion that the Thai police were right to arrest her is hard to avoid.

What is of concern, is the Sunday Times' knee-jerk assumption that the couple had done nothing wrong, and that the Thai authorities were lying.

Was Xi Lin really 'falsely accused', as the paper claimed so confidently?

In this respect, the case is similar to that of Annice Smoel, the Australian 'bar mat bandit' who cried foul when she was arrested for theft in Phuket in May.

Shrill headlines in the Australian media denounced Thai justice, but when the facts of the case emerged, it was difficult to feel any sympathy for Mrs Smoel.

Witnesses watched her fold the heavy rubber 'Aussie Bar' mat into her bag, then when undercover police stopped her outside the bar, she tried to flee. When she was eventually caught, she abused the arresting officers.

Did she really deserve an apology from the governor of Phuket? Or the reported 650,000 baht an Australian women's magazine paid for her 'story'?

It goes without saying that this kind of media coverage is damaging to Thailand's already-battered tourism industry, and more importantly, the lives of the people that industry supports.

Of course, nothing shifts papers in London and Melbourne like tales of upstanding tourists falling foul of corrupt Far Eastern law enforcement.

But an observer more sympathetic to Thailand and its people might wonder if the Western media is really fighting for justice – or pandering to prejudice. - The Editor



How to stop an airborne menace

The Gazette has run a number of stories on the efforts of the Thai authorities to contain (A)H1N1 influenza.

The most recent showed several dozen soldiers all washing their hands in the same bucket of water – grossly unhygienic.

Spraying disinfectant on the streets was also touted as a remedy, as was scrubbing down airport and school surfaces.

I'd like to remind the public health officials, or whoever is making these decisions, that (A)H1N1 is an *airborne* virus.

It has to be breathed deeply into the lungs in order to take hold and multiply.

Sneezing and coughing into the air are the main ways it is spread, not by hand-tosurface contact.

May I suggest our citizens would be better served if, instead of being instructed to wash their hands while singing 'happy birthday' (and hands are recontaminated almost immediately by turning off the tap or touching the door knob), they learned to keep their hands away from their eyes, nose and mouth.

Picking the nose is oddly commonplace for a culture so obsessed with cleanliness, as is rubbing the eyes.

These are two of the best ways for an upper-respiratory (rhinovirus) infection to find its way into the warm, moist places it needs to take hold and replicate.

For a healthier citizenry, authorities should be teaching the public: Don't touch your eyes, nose or mouth.

The low-down on chikungunya



FIRST PERSON

Since chikungunya first appeared on Phuket in May, with four confirmed cases, the number of sufferers has shot to over 2000 in the province. The vector for the disease is the Aedes mosquito, which also spreads misery

in the form of yellow and dengue fevers. Although not fatal, there are, as yet, no antiviral drug treatments for chikungunya, nor is there a vaccine against it. Treatment is supportive, including bed rest and painkillers, especially paracetamol. The *Gazette*'s Fraser Morton was the first reported case of a foreigner on Phuket being infected with the disease. Here's how it feels.

loody awful. But let's not stop there. It has been over a month and a half since I contracted chikungunya, and luckily, aside from occasional back pains and throbbing in my knees and wrists, I seem to have come away relatively unscathed by the disease.

To all those reading this now, if you are infected with chikungunya, I empathize wholly.

And as my doctor and girlfriend insisted, take plenty of rest, and under no circumstances over-exert yourself.

In my case, initial warning signs that something was awry started when I was in work (of all places) approximately four hours after I was bitten.

A pounding headache and nausea were my initial symptoms.

Labeling the symptoms a result of a crass, demanding and irate boss (at the time), I left work and headed to the IBAP meeting in Patong.

It was here I started to experience heightened symptoms, a raised temperature, sore throat, nausea and weakness.

Leaving early and now unable to drive home my girlfriend began to worry when we opened our front door and I promptly keeled over into the fetal position on our porch.

It was now 10pm, six hours

after my first symptoms bore their ugly heads.

Speaking of ugly heads, while shaking uncontrollably on our cold tiled floor, hugging my knees, writhing with shivers, my girlfriend noticed the spots on my neck.

Lifting my shirt, she discovered a widespread rash that covered my chest, stomach, back, legs and neck.

The spots seemed to be under the skin, and by that I mean there was no outbreak of whiteheads, but rather a more subtle and itchy rash, similar to the hundreds of poison ivy rashes I've had as a boy.

My girlfriend drove me to the Phuket International Hospital.

My temperature topped 40 degrees and my heart rate was unusually high.

A blood sample was taken, and the results came back within an hour.

My doctor told me he had ruled out dengue fever, but that further tests would be needed because he suspected I had 'chikungunya fever'.

I had heard rumors of the disease that had been sweeping southern Thailand at the time and a convention in Phuket Town was reporting cases, but I never thought my sickness could be accredited to the disease.

I was put onto a bed and wheeled upstairs to my hospital

ward for the night and I passed signs on the walls displaying information on the risks of chikungunya – a first at the time.

For the next few days,I couldn't keep down any water or food, so I was placed on a drip and given painkillers.

Two days later and 19,000 baht lighter in wallet, I finally left hospital but was told I should not return to work until I regained my strength.

It's strange to receive phone calls that start, "Hi, how are you, I hear you have the chika-what-do-you-call-it disease," or "How do you say the name of what you have again."

But that's what all my friends said when they found out I had the disease.

My doctor put me on a regimented prescription of several drugs, mainly painkillers, some virus-related, some for the stomach and some for nausea.

Not an easy feat to swallow when you suffer from my own personal affliction called 'unable-to-swallow-pills syndrome'.

Joking aside, my experience with chikungunya was unpleasant to say the least.

It's a debilitating sickness that leaves you constantly tired for weeks after. I had severe aches and pain for two weeks.

Some are ongoing but have subsided in their intensity.

From recent cases it seems

clear that hundreds of sufferers are slipping under the PPHO's radar due to people dealing with the cases independently or going to private clinics.

Despite reports, foreigners as well as locals and migrants have been seeking assistance from private clinics, which make it difficult for the PPHO to compile accurate statistics.

Some say private clinics can't help treat cases.

Of course they can.

It just means assessing the numbers and the rate of infection is proving difficult.

After speaking to other people who've been infected, it

is also apparent that although similar symptoms are experienced by everyone infected with chikungunya, the timing of the symptoms can vary.

For some, a rash may appear first, while for others the disease will begin with a fever.

Pains and aches vary too, and it appears evident the disease homes in on already weakened muscular pains in the body (hence my back pain from all the manual labor involved in writing for a living).

If you experience any of the symptoms I have mentioned then please, take precautions and consult a doctor.

I want to bring my gold coin collection into Thailand

Years ago I inherited 33 gold Krugerrand coins, presently worth about \$US32,000. I plan to move to Phuket from the USA and will keep the coins in a safe box here. When entering the country, do I have to pay any customs fees, tariffs or other charges? What forms do I have to fill out?

An officer from the Customs Department in Phuket replies:

Gold and jewelery are products controlled by the Customs Department.

But if the gold coins are your personal possessions, you don't need advance permission from customs to bring them in, nor do you have to pay tax because you will not be exchanging them for money.

However, you do have to notify customs you are bringing them in when you enter Thailand.

If you move back you will have to notify them again.

You will also need to prove that you are moving to Thailand when you check in with customs.

You could do this, for example, by showing you are buying a house in Thailand, have a company here, or will work here.

10-man Phuket FC slump to yet another defeat at Surakul Stadium

fifth straight home defeat following a disappointing 2-1 loss at Surakul Stadium last Sunday.

The new-look Sea Dragons took the lead midway through the first half, but two Narathiwat goals either side of half time consigned Phuket FC to their sixth defeat in eight matches.

Phuket FC finished the match with only 10 men following the second half sending off of Sama-ann Poedok on a miserable night for the home side.

It may be a new-look squad but for Phuket FC's longsuffering fans, the result was all too familiar.

Expectation was rife as a record crowd turned out for the match eager to see if a revamped Phuket squad could improve on a disappointing start to its inaugural campaign.

Only two players remained from the original squad, which has 15 new members, including a contingent of African players.

Center forward Peka, from Cameroon, gave the side a muchneeded physical presence up front and was a constant threat from set pieces, while Sidibe Daouda, from the Ivory Coast, looks a

huket FC slumped to their promising addition to the squad.

A quick and skillful right winger, Daouda has the potential to make a strong impression in the second half of the season.

Despite having the tallest player on the pitch leading the line, to their credit Phuket were reluctant to play the ball long, preferring to stick to a methodical passing game.

Unfortunately Phuket's defensive frailties appear not to have been addressed in the mid-season break, with the defenders seemingly reluctant to use their heads.

A series of hopeful long balls from the away team were not dealt with and at one stage the Narathiwat striker burst through only to be seemingly tripped in the box.

However they were to be undone by some more inept refereeing when Narathiwat were awarded a free kick for an innocuous challenge on the edge of the Phuket box.

From the resulting kick Narathiwat equalized, possibly with the aid of a small deflection.

Worse was to come early in the second half when Phuket defender Sama-ann was sent off for a second bookable offense.

With the man advantage, Narathiwat were now in the ascendancy and a swift counter attack left the Phuket defense exposed and gifted the Narathiwat striker the simplest of finishes.

Playing with 10 men, Phuket FC had a mountain to climb. Sone spurned a late chance to salvage a first ever home point, and it was too little too late for the desperate home side who have accumulated four points

Keep your plug snug

Repairing a multiple-outlet extension cable



ne thing I'm sure everyone uses here in Thailand are those extension cords with multiple-outlet boxes at the end. The problem is that their outlets often become "loose", requiring the plugs to be jiggled into position, or even held in place, rendering them practically useless. This is caused by several things, but mostly by the low-quality of brass used in the internal contacts, and the lack of precision forming when they are pressed into shape.

So, to create a more positive contact with any inserted plugs, one must re-form, or bend back into a tighter alignment, these inter-

There are more than 20 different types of brass, an alloy composed of copper and zinc (and sometimes other metals) in varying proportions, depending upon the application. The brass used in electrical outlets in the West has a higher degree of 'springiness', created by adding manganese to the brass. The brass used here is noticeably different, and the brass doesn't spring back into shape as well. The result is that after some use, the contacts will be bent out of position from the constant insertion and removal of electrical plugs.


In the box [photos 1 and 2], the wires are soldered to the bottom of the removable contact strips. The box [photos 3] and 41 has them soldered directly onto one of the screws that hold each contact strip in place. This means that this type is best worked on with the contacts in place, a little more challenging but not impossible.

Look at the difference between the brass contacts themselves. In [photo 2], the bottom of the brass strip is straight and flat, and the upright pieces have been bent precisely at the base, compared to the rounded bends on the other. Notice also the slightly different color of the better quality brass, with its denser, smoother surface. The box is overall of a better design. Tip: in [photo 4], the gray tape around the power cord is not a repair, it's a strain-relief. It's too large to go back out through the hole without opening the box, so if the cord is tugged it won't pull loose from the switch inside and ruin the box. Since you're opening the box anyway, you should try this.

First, open your outlet box (unplugged, of course). Depending upon the brand, either remove the back cover [photo 4] or unscrew the surface-mounted retaining screws from the contacts' 'containers', as in photo 1. Be careful when unscrewing these minute screws to avoid stripping the slots.

Properly re-shaping these contacts is all a matter of touch. Using your needlenose pliers, grip the upright part of the contact, very carefully, near the base. If you have the type in [photo 4], you'll have to maneuver the tips of the needlenose while holding the handles very close to the edge of the box. The fine-point needlenoses are good for this.

If you have the type in [photo 2] with removable con-







just beneath that point. Depending on the brand, this may not be

tacts, use a second pair of needlenose pliers to hold the base of the contact-strip. Try to keep the bottom edge of the jaws parallel to the base of the contactstrip. If not, you'll find the upright portion bending on an angle, out of line with its opposing side.

Grip the pliers tightly and bend slowly, gently, until the side you're working on moves to just the center portion of the space between the contacts' tips. Now do the other side. Bend them until they're almost, but not quite, touching.

Now, most of the outlet boxes sold here have holes that are designed to handle both rounded and flat-pronged plugs, so you have to place the center of the space between the contact tips directly beneath the point where the two shapes of the holes combine. That is, where the circular part of the hole joins the straight, rectangular portion. Basically, that's the whole job. Bend the contact strip uprights until the opening between them is

straight above the center of the contact strip's base, it may be a little to one side.

Reassemble the box, inspect visually to be sure the tips of the contacts' uprights are in the right place and then check by carefully inserting a plug. The 'grip' should be firm but not too tight, and you shouldn't have to insert one side on an angle first to get the other to fit in.

If you do, it means the plug is hitting the tip of the upright, and they need to be realigned again. Because the 'fit' cannot be checked (except roughly by eye) while the box is apart, this can be a trial and error procedure.

Stay cool and adjust the contacts again. Ensure that the spaces between the uprights' tips, and not the tips themselves, are directly beneath the plug holes.


That should do it. Plug in your box, plug in the fan, sit back and have a beer. See you next time!

make or break perceptions. With people, it only takes three seconds to make an indelible impression.

You may intrigue some and disenchant others. With places, it's only natural we pass these same judgments.

But what first impressions do the millions of tourists arriving on Phuket each year formulate?

Maybe the process starts when visitors scan the island's topography on the descent into Phuket International Airport. Or maybe it's the initial encounters with taxi hawkers at the airport or the well-appointed hotel staff who hand weary travelers a cold towel upon their arrival that starts the perceptual process for tourists.

Despite these first impressions, quite possibly it's the latenight tawdry exploits on Soi Bangla that tourists relay to friends and family back home.

But what first impressions were made on the 6000-plus men and women of the British and American navies who arrived on Phuket last month?

As their ships neared Phuket's deep sea port in Ao Makham maybe their preconceived notions of bustling nightlife, crowded beaches and a well developed tourist industry Phuket-based Radisson Plaza

the peaceful port on the Phuket's East coast.

Maybe they saw land and just craved a decent bed and some privacy from their bunkmates for a night.

Perhaps as the ship edged further into the bay, some breathed in and pondered Phuket's identity as an island in transition; architectural modesty and modernity, poverty and paradise - underdeveloped land being replaced by mass develop-

All these assertions are credible during a first encounter with Phuket's East coast.

For most, the current impression of Ao Makham, is a corner of Phuket on the move.

Major world players in hospitality are honing in on Ao Makham.

The US-based hospitality giant The Carlson Group has arrived and two of its subsidiary companies have opened hotels. The Regent Phuket Cape Panwa, currently under construction, is set to follow the Radisson Plaza Phuket Panwa Beach, which opened on July 2.

Within two years, the group expects to have 1,500 rooms available under the Radission Plaza brand nationwide. The

irst impressions can evaporated as they neared being the first of seven planned hotels.

> Set on 10 acres of land, the 211-room resort includes 14 ocean villas and 15 pool villas as well as conference and banqueting facilities for up to 220 people - an attractive selling point for potential corporate clients.

> The Radisson Plaza service philosophy is: 'Yes I can', reminiscent of a certain Presidential campaign message, 'Yes, we can.'

> It worked for Obama, and with 405 locations in 68 countries, Radisson Hotels seem to be making the right impression too.

> The Carlson-owned Regent Phuket Cape Panwa is just a stones throw along the beach from the Radisson Plaza. The Regent hugs the peninsula of Ao Makham, elevated above lapping waters that tickle the shoreline.

> Idyllic adjectives aside, the arrival of the Regent Phuket Cape Panwa is the first Thailand venture for Regent Hotels, adding to the chain's Asian portfolio that has established properties in Beijing and Shanghai, both ranked in the top-500 hotels around the world. The 106-room resort will offer 48 terrace rooms, 22 deluxe villas, 35 pool villas and one Presidential villa. Later this year the Regent Bangkok will also

Less than five minutes drive from 'Carlson's Corner' in Makham Bay, The Sheraton brand is also flexing it's metaphorical biceps with the initial stages of the Four Points by Sheraton Hotel underway.

The Four Points is expected to open in 2011.

With the already soughtafter Cape Panwa Hotel and Spa setting the tone for luxury on Phuket's Southeast coast, Ao Makham and Cape Panwa seem to have made an impression on the major brands in hospitality worldwide.



eath is one of the few things in life that you can guarantee will happen to you, but because it is not the most pleasant thing to think about, proper planning for the day we meet our maker is often overlooked.

Most people understand the importance of making a Last Will and Testament before they die.

People who have acquired property with considerable value in a foreign country should prepare a will specific to administering the estate in that country.


Although a will is not legally required in Thailand to pass on your assets to your heirs, they will surely be grateful if you have prepared legal documentation in advance which may help simplify the allocation of assets following your death.

For people who are considering buying property in Thailand, the drafting of a specific will is highly recommended.

A clear, detailed and accurate description of how assets are to be allocated when you are no longer around will help protect the interests of your beneficiaries.

Each country has its own laws and regulations describing the relevant formalities upon someone's death.

Your will needs to comply

with the relevant regulations of that country.

A will drafted in compliance with the laws of your country of origin might conflict with the relevant laws in Thailand.

It is therefore advisable to prepare a separate will for each jurisdiction which governs each of your assets.

In other words, it is important to understand that your will,

which might be perfectly legal under the laws of your home country, may be deemed as null and void under the laws of your second home.

It also needs needs to be considered that a will drafted by a lawyer in your home country might include documentation written in your native language.

Because the official language of Thailand is Thai, those documents will have to be translated into Thai.

Those translations must be issued by official bodies, such as a notary public, an embassy or a government authority.

Leaving this to your heirs to do after your death could be troublesome, time consuming and expensive.

In the context of estate planning, it is also recommended that you verify whether your property and your beneficaries' interests are sufficiently protected by and through a robust legal structure underlying the property to be passed on.

Whenever buying property, especially in a foreign country, you need to consider that certain rights or conditions may have to be adhered to in order to make your assets inheritable.

This is an important aspect and should be discussed with your

lawyer, ideally *before* choosing and buying a property, to ensurethat it fulfils your requirments in this specific matter.

To summarise, whenever buying property, protecting your investment should be of the highest priority.


The preparation of a will can be a useful instrument in this context and will protect the interests of your heirs and minimize the risks.

Therefore, when investing a significant amount of capital, especially in a foreign country, it is wise to hire a professional consultant who is familiar with estate planning and inheritance in that country.

Securing your heirs' interests where there may be different or even unknown laws, regulations and formalities based on a different historical and cultural background, could help them to avoid some very unpleasant surprises.

here are only two things in life you can be absolutely sure of; death and taxes.

Despite a recent boom market for real estate on the island, there are many existing projects that are now between 10 and 15 years old, which is no more than a blip on the property market monitor.

There are two distinct groups within the existing Phuket purchasers pool; those who reside full- or part-term and those who bought as an investment for a return from capital appreciation and rental yields.

Condo-hotels play catch up

However, owners are now moving into both camps; shifting their investment strategies depending on their circumstances.

We now see hotel-managed products offering short-term rent-al guarantees. As the market softens, more and more pure residential projects have turned to offering this type of scheme. They install hotel management companies to differentiate their product and spur sales.

We are also seeing established condo-hotel projects being pushed aside by new hotels. There is shrinking demand for uncompetative condo-hotels. Hotels are fundamentally capital intensive as an asset class.

While hotel management companies typically reserve 3% of revenue for replacement and capital work, the developer's total expenses typically range from 5-8% of total turnover in a 10-year period.

That capital has to be plowed back into the property to maintain it and keep it viable in the marketplace.

Take a typical condo-hotel in which a residential structure has been put together. One of the key points for owners is keeping maintenance and assessments at

a reasonable level.

Most projects have used the straight 'resico' (residential) market to compare these fees. In reality, estate management companies are continually under the gun to contain expenditure.

Many hotels put aside funds to cover the replacement of furniture, fixtures and equipment, but condo-hotel projects often put these expenses on the back burner, because most owners do not reside in the properties full time and they want the lowest possible out-of-pocket spend.

All in all, it's a recipe for disaster. The impact is now being felt at many condo and apart-

ment projects here. Hotel furniture packages in an under-supplied market are not applicable today. Capital infrastructure, which is expensive to upgrade, cannot be covered by maintenance fees or sinking funds.

Information technology is another key component in hotels with front- and back-office software being frequently updated. So where does the money come from?

The reality of condo-hotels is that hotel management acts as an agency. They take care of operations and employees on behalf of the owner. In most cases, the financial downside is limited.

Operators endeavor to perform through fees coming from a combination of revenue and bottom-line gross operating profit. So once a developer has sold off a project and exited, it's up to the unit owners to fund capital infusions and operate cashflow, including losses, and to continually upgrade the property.

We now see residential projects wanting to convert to hotel operations, but many lack the proper infrastructure and equipment to do so, such as computers, vehicles and service areas.

More importantly, inexperienced project owners often ex-

pect guests to simply start showing up when they open up as a hotel, but it takes time to gear up sales and marketing. Most new hotels have already invested a lot of time and money on marketing their new venue for about a year before they open the doors to guests.

For conversions, property owners need to dip into their pockets and retro-fit standard furniture packages and operating equipment. They also need to provide working capital along with money for sales and marketing.

It's not an investment in their units, it's a yield-based investment made to spur rental returns

More interesting is when you try to marry the two different sets of owners in a project when they each come in with an entirely different objective.

Those who live or reside there part time want to contain ongoing fees or additional investment, while the second group, who look to returns, need to view rentals with growing significance.

We are aware of at least one project on the island that has been paralyzed by ongoing differences of opinion, causing their capital appreciation and resale market potential to decline.

None of these are issues are going to go anywhere soon. They'll continue to provide content for this column, without a doubt.


It's important to understand and work with estate management companies and hotel operators in order to ensure long-term capital budgets and forecasts are prepared.

Yardsticks of performance continue to be there, but it's impractical to think that if you buy into a lifestyle property, revenue will always cover costs.

Upside and downside risks are always present in any investment

Capital appreciation growth is the best objective of any property owner.
