

'World's oldest man' living here on Phuket

BUDDHIST monk in Phuket who could be the world's oldest living man will celebrate his 113th birthday this month.

Luang Pu Supha lives at a temple named after him in Chalong, and according to his identification papers, he was born in Sakon Nakhon province on September 17, 1896.

Luang Pu Supha was born four days earlier than American Walter Breuning, who is claiming Guinness World Records' title of the 'Oldest Living Man'.

Breuning will celebrate his 113th birthday on September 21.

According to the Guinness World Records' official website, the title was to be awarded to Breuning following the death of British World War One veteran, Henry Allingham, who died on July 18 this year, aged 113.

Allingham, who was the last surviving British WW1 veteran, inherited the title, albeit briefly, from Tomoji Tanabe, a Japanese

national who died on June 19.

Guinness World Records said in July a formal announcement would be made as soon as the record had been verified by a gerontology expert.

But that was before Luang Supha's age was known.

His official identification

documents, including house registration and ID card, show that he is four days older than the American, making him the world's oldest living man.

Thanapong Korudom, President of the Wat Luang Pu Supha committee, said he would like to invite Guinness World

Records to come to Phuket and verify that Luang Pu Supha is the oldest living man in the world.

The secret to the aged monk's longevity is to "eat less, speak less and always speak the truth".

He said the revered monk was still happy and healthy despite his age, but ate only nine mouthfuls of food at each meal.

'We should all look within ourselves and question how Luang Pu Supha has managed to achieve his great age," he said.

Luang Pu Supha avoids spices and salts in his diet, but is said to have a sweet tooth – his favorite desert being khao neaw kaew (sticky rice with sugar).

Luang Pu Supha has lived through several historical events, including Siam changing its name to Thailand in 1939, the Japanese occupation of Thailand in 1942, Thailand becoming the 55th member of the United Nations in 1946, the coronation of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej in 1950 and the 2004 tsunami.

Nowadays, Luang Pu Supha lives quietly at his Chalong temple.

In his long lifetime, he has traveled the world in search of what Khun Thanapong says is 'a life dedicated to truth'.

In 1905, when he was nine years old, his father took him to study Buddhism at Pai Yai Temple in Ubon Ratchathani.

He would not see his family again until 1957.

In 1916, Luang Pu Supha embarked upon his official ordination pilgrimage, taking him into the mountains of Laos where he was ordained as a monk.

Six years later, he traveled to Burma where he met other Thai monks who were on a pilgrimage to India.

Joining the monks, the young Luang Pu Supha set off on a series of adventures which took him to China, then Europe, before embarking on a mammoth journey back to Thailand.

At age 61, Luang Pu Supha arrived back at his home province and visited his relatives for the first time since he was nine.

Piyawat Siihaveerachart, another committee member and close friend of Luang Pu Supha, said the revered monk came to Phuket when he was in his sixties because he wanted to help sea gypsy villagers in Koh Sireh.

"The villagers didn't follow a religion, but Luang Pu Supha stayed with them, taught them about Buddhism and also built a temple," he said.

Luang Pu Supha's birthday celebrations will begin on September 16 with a sermon by the head monk from Chonpratharnrangsarit Temple at 4pm.

The next day, festivities will start at 6.09am and end at 2pm.

All members of the public are welcome to join the celebrations, which will be held at Wat Luang Pu Supha in Chalong.

Red and yellow shirts react to 'Da Torpedo' sentencing

HUKET's red- and yellow-shirt factions have reacted to last week's sentencing of political activist Daranee Chancheonsilapakul, aka 'Da Torpedo', to 18 years in prison for insulting the monarchy.

The Criminal Court ruled that Ms Daranee, 51, made several remarks constituting lese majeste at three United Front for Democracy against Dictatorship (UDD) rallies in Bangkok earlier this year.

She was sentenced to three consecutive six-year sentences, without parole.

Cops bust fish poacher Gov dishes out advice

HUKET Marine Police officers busted a tropical fish poaching ring last Tuesday, seizing hundreds of valuable aquarium fish and coral blooms from a house in Rawai.

Police said the owner of the house, Suthee Sirisaringkarn, hired local fishermen to illegally catch the fish, many of which were worth up to 2,000 baht each.

Around 200 living coral blooms and around 400 tropical fish and other creatures were found in tanks in the house. including butterflyfish, wrasses, parrotfish, damselfish, angelfish and giant clams.

Mr Suthee, 34, from Bangkok, told police he planned to send the creatures to Chiang Mai to sell to collectors.

He has been charged with possession of protected species and possession of tropical fish without permission from the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment.

All of the creatures are being kept by the Department of Marine and Coastal Resources (DMCR) at its center at Cape Panwa.

Prajuap Mokarat, a DMCR officer, said the fish ranged in value from 500 to 2,000 baht.

"They caught most of them at the coral reefs around Koh Racha and Koh Khai," he said.

Mr Prajuap said this kind of poaching ring had been uncovered many times before but arrests were rarely made because it was difficult to get the evidence required to get a search warrant issued by the court.

Another DMCR staff member said some of the fish were sick with cyanide poisoning.

"Some of them are dying because whoever caught them used cyanide to stun them so they'd float to the surface and be easy to catch," she said.

Meanwhile, in an unrelated case, a man was arrested last Wednesday night in Phang Nga province for attempting to smuggle coral blooms.

Takua Pa Police received a tip-off that the man had boarded a bus heading to Bangkok at Takua Pa bus station with a foamwrapped crate containing the coral.

Police arrested the man and have charged him with illegal possession of protected species.

More than 180 coral blooms were recovered, including anchor coral and cup coral.

FTER dishing out 156,000 baht in cash to some of the Lisland's poorest families at a ceremony at the Phuket City Municipal Offices last week, Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisangop dished out some advice.

Phuket's poor must work harder, stop gambling and not spend so much time watching bird singing contests, the governor told his audience.

Otherwise, he said, foreigners would take their jobs.

Gov Wichai and other officials handed 78 families 2,000 baht each on behalf of the Phuket Social Development and Human Security Office at the ceremony last Tuesday morning.

"There are around 80,000 aliens such as Rohingya and Burmese living in Phuket now," the governor said.

"Most of them work hard. More and more, they're taking local people's jobs, such as rubber tapping," he continued.

"They're improving their lives and earning money," he said.

Phuket people, however, were getting lazier and indulging themselves too much, Gov Wichai said.

"Don't spend all your time watching bulbul singing contests. Stop spending your money on the lottery.'

"These activities will make you poor," the governor concluded.

Island's foreign investors coming under scrutiny

FACT-finding effort is underway in Phuket to compile information about local businesses in which Thai people are hired by foreigners as their nominees – a practice which is generally illegal under Thailand's Foreign Business Act.

Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop, who ordered the investigation, said he was not discriminating against foreign investors, but was guarding against the illegal use of Thais as nominee shareholders by foreigners.

Under Thai law, foreigners can own no more than 49 percent of any business venture with Thais.

An ongoing practice, local authorities say, is that foreigners eventually gain control over such companies illegally.

To scrutinize foreign businesses, the Phuket Provincial Revenue office is checking foreigners' tax payments, while the Treasury office is scrutinizing ownership of condominium space.

Immigration police are examining the visa and residence status of expatriates involved in Phuket-based businesses.

Local authorities and the Interior Ministry will look at all the information and decide on what to do if their fact-finding reveals illegal shareholdings, the governor said.

Patong Deputy Mayor Chairat Sukbhal dismissed reports which stated that most hotels on Phuket were owned by foreigners, saying most were operated as joint ventures, or under management staffed by foreign executives.

Meanwhile, Phuket's Provincial Business and Trade Office said a regulation requiring joint Thai-foreign businesses to produce bank accounts with a high minimum balance on deposit had been revoked because it could not effectively serve as proof of substantial business funding.

"In most cases, the money was withdrawn immediately from the bank accounts once account statements were presented to Thai authorities as proof," office head Weerachai Tantiwat-thanawallop said. -Sarinee Prab/The Nation

'More will die' at Karon Beach, leader predicts

N the wake of the drowning of a Russian man off Karon Beach, a local leader has warned that 'more will die in the days to come'.

Karon tambon chief Winai Chitchiew said beach guards were under-equipped, underpaid and couldn't guarantee tourists' safety.

So far during this year's monsoon season at least 10 people have drowned in Karon, he said.

On Wednesday morning, Russian tourist Alexander Lukin's decomposing body washed up on the popular west coast beach, recently named the world's fourth best for families by the Lonely *Planet* guide.

The 32-year-old disappeared in the surf on Sunday, swallowed up by two-meter-high waves before friends and beach guards could reach him.

In pouring rain, officials searched for Mr Lukin in a borrowed speedboat, but their efforts were in vain.

Beach guards had warned Mr Lukin and his friends not to swim in the sea, but they were ignored, Mr Winai said.

As is the case throughout monsoon season, red flags warning people not to swim were on display.

Earlier this year, LP Laikhun Co Ltd signed a contract with the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO) to provide beach guards and equipment at Phuket's most popular beaches, including Karon

Mr Winai said the equipment provided by the company was inadequate.

"The PPAO have paid the company 10 million baht, but Thais and foreigners are still drowning," he said.

The PPAO contract did not require the beach guards to have jet-skis, yet these were the fastest way to get to tourists in trouble in the sea, he said.

"The guards are forced to borrow jet-skis from local operators," Mr Winai said.
Mr Winai said dinghies

provided under the contract couldn't be used during monsoon season because of the size of the waves.

The beach guards had been supplied with large beginners' surfboards, rather than the professional surfboards needed to reach people quickly, Mr Winai said.

The beach guards have not been supplied with rescue reels, he added, referring to ropes which attach to the guard,

allowing them to be pulled back to shore if they get into trouble during a rescue.

Moreover, the people being paid to do such an important job were earning just 8,000 to 9,000 baht a month, Mr Winai said.

"This isn't enough," he said. The job is very dangerous. Most of these guys have families. They don't want to risk their lives when they have to rely on an inadequate set of life-saving equipment," he said.

Karon Municipality will set aside a budget to provide more beach guards with a full set of life-saving equipment – but not until next year, he said.

Until then, there will be more drownings on Karon Beach, he predicted.

"Phuket is a tourist destination. We shouldn't just be taking money from tourists – we have to keep them alive, too," Mr Winai said.

Bureaucracy blamed for warning buoy debacle

Budget not an issue with Bt300m set aside for tsunami warning system operations

HE tsunami detection buoy off Phuket will be replaced "as soon as possible", the National Disaster Warning Center (NDWC) has revealed.

NDWC Deputy Director Somsak Khawsuwan told the Gazette the maintenance mission will take place as soon as conditions at sea allow.

"We can't wait until the end of the monsoon season," he said.

Launched in December 2006, the buoy ceased transmitting data in mid-June this year when its battery finally ran out, the NDWC admitted in July.

But mysteriously, the USbuilt buoy powered up again last month and resumed transmitting on August 5, just five days before a large earthquake occurred north of the Andaman Islands.

According to the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), the buoy is now operating in 'emergency mode', using a back-up battery that will run out in September or October this year.

Mr Somsak said bureaucracy, not a lack of budgeting, had been the reason for the delay in replacing the battery and doing routine annual maintenance.

"We have to maintain the DART buoy every year. We received a fiscal budget in 2007, but we always have problems," Mr Somsak said.

the delay has been bureaucratic changes introduced by a series of governments.

Established by then-Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, the NDWC was subsequently placed under the Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Ministry's Meteorological Department, then shifted to the The primary cause for Prime Minister's Office, then back to the ICT Ministry.

Backed by a 48-million-baht budget, the NDWC has ordered one new DART buoy from the US-based NOAA and has a designated contractor for the replacement mission.

Mr Somsak said "we are very lucky" that the existing DART buoy, located 600 nautical miles northwest of Phuket, is still transmitting data - almost two years after the expected one-year lifespan of its original power supply should have expired.

The long overdue battery change and maintenance mission would begin as soon as sea conditions permit, said

Under the plan, technical experts from the NOAA will help replace the existing buoy with a new unit.

The old unit will be brought ashore for maintenance and redeployed a year later, at which time the second unit will be brought ashore for maintenance.

Mr Somsak said the procedure will be conducted annually as part of a 'sustainable' maintenance regimen.

"Last time we used two ships from the Royal Thai Navy but if we don't have many people with us this year, we may use only one navy vessel," he said.

The 'last time' he referred to was the original deployment in December 2006, when a second navy ship took media personnel.

"It will take around 10 days in total. We may use the vessel MV Seafdec again, sailing from Phuket Deep Sea Port," he said.

"The trip will cost around 48 million baht and we are fully prepared."

In related developments, the NDWC has already received a 165-million-baht budget to deploy two more warning buoys 200 nautical miles off the Andaman coastline next year.

The new buoys should give the NDWC 30 minutes lead time before any future tsunami waves reach the coast.

Maintenance of the units will be subcontracted to a private firm by 'e-auction', said Mr Somsak.

The NDWC has also been given an 88-million-baht budget to improve its 144 disaster warning towers located around Thailand, 79 of which are in the six Andaman coast provinces.

The agency has budgeted 5 million baht annually to conduct evacuation drills.

The next drill, scheduled to take place in Chumphon on November 5, will be based on a scenario of a typhoon - one similar in size and power to Typhoon Gay that ravaged that province in 1989.

In fiscal 2010, the agency will receive an operation budget of 90 million baht, 10 percent less than requested, Mr Somsak said.

Loan shark spooked by suicide cell spirit

BANGKOK: A loan shark found heard a voice whispering in his ear. the police were the least of his worries after being detained in a haunted cell.

Last Tuesday, Crime Suppression Division (CSD) officers arrested Sombun Thongkham, 39, for extortion and unauthorized money lending, and placed him in custody at CSD headquarters on Phahonyothin Rd.

Around 3am the following morning, the duty sergeant heard Mr Sombun screaming for help from his cell.

He went to see what was wrong, and found Mr Sombun shaking and white as a sheet.

The prisoner told the officer that a ghost had tried to persuade him to kill himself in the cell.

Mr Sombun said he was awoken by someone tapping him on the leg.

He saw a man sitting on the end of his bed. The man was aged around 40 and wearing a red shirt.

The man told him to get showered and brush his teeth and come and live with him.

Mr Sombun said he was still half asleep and thought it was another prisoner, but as he was falling back to sleep he suddenly remembered he was the only prisoner in the cell.

When he looked around, however, the man had vanished.

Mr Sombun said he put the incident down to being a very vivid dream.

A little later, however, he

The voice told him to go and take a good look at the cell bars. It then told him to choose which one he wanted to hang himself from.

The voice said it would show him how to hang himself with a piece of clothing so he could escape punishment for his crimes, Mr Sombun said. At this point he screamed for the sergeant.

Mr Sombun asked the sergeant if he could go and sleep in another cell. He also asked the sergeant to call a friend to come and sleep outside the cell door as he was too scared to stay by himself.

The next morning, investigating officer Lt Col Sawai Chamlamjiak took the stillterrified Mr Sombun to be detained in another building.

CSD officers said Mr Sombun was not the first prisoner to be visited while in that particular cell.

Police had previously cut down three other prisoners who had tried to hang themselves.

One of the rescued men later hung himself at home.

Police said the incidents started after a man arrested for raping his niece hung himself in the cell.

Officers said they had performed a merit-making ceremony to try and make the spirit leave the cell, but it obviously hadn't worked.

He then tried to rape her again, but was interrupted by monks who heard the victim's cries.


Mr Nikhom fled and hid in a toilet. Monks guarded the door until police arrived to arrest him.

The signs of economic revival

eports are abound in the international media that claim we are seeing the first 'green shoots' of recovery emerge on the slippery road to economic stabilization.

We are led to believe that consumer confidence is revitalized, the housing sales slump in the US has leveled off and the Gross Domestic Product has increased a little in a few European countries.

So what 'green shoots' are we seeing here in Thailand, and more specifically in Krabi?

The Tourism Council of Thailand (TCT) have had a tough time keeping track of tourist arrival figures entering the Kingdom.

For 2009, the projected volume of tourists entering the country was set at 14 million.

This number was slashed to 13.1 million and then reduced again to 11 million.

However, in recent weeks, the TCT have bumped the figure back up to 13.1 million on the back of a 10 percent increase in arrivals forecast for the fourth quarter of 2009.

The projected figures and subse-quent optimism being categorized by the TCT may be accredited to the following factors:

We have seen marked improvements in the domestic poli-tical climate and the stabilization of the international economic markets.

In addition, the A(H1N1) influenza pandemic is retreating, the Thai government has implemented a host of incentives to encourage business recovery and finally, tour operators have also capitalized on the slump by offering some slash-price deals to boost tourist arrivals for the end of the year.

While these are all positive factors, some are still in a fragile state.

The internal political situation could change at any time – a recent trip to Chiang Mai confirmed my suspicions that the red shirts are not going to simply go quietly, while the deceleration of the A(H1N1) pandemic can change at any time, especially as the northern hemisphere enters its traditional flu season.

Local Revival?

'Green shoots' also seem to be emerging on a local scale.

One specific to Krabi is the re-introduction of direct flights from Singapore to Krabi by Tiger Airways. Beginning on October 25, the airline will offer four flights a week at a special promotion price of 535 baht a flight.

Considering you are lucky to get a flight to from Krabi to Bangkok on Thai Air for less than 2,000 baht, this is a fantastic deal and should attract a large number of passengers to Krabi.

Another green shoot is the improvement in the local real estate market.

The market has picked up in the past few months after a long period of very slow sales.

Awasda Saengket, Director of Krabi Custom Homes, has seen

a substantial increase in housing rentals, followed by spiked demand for land purchases and business properties.

Prices have remained relatively firm, with the larger land owners not breaking price, although a number of financially distressed owners have sold smaller lots at discounted prices to raise capital.

Real estate 'vultures', who search for properties being sold at massively reduced prices or properties that have been repossessed by banks, have had meager success in the local market in Krabi.

With the market turning positive once more, many of these opportunities will most likely disappear.

Scams continue

Over the year, we have docu-

mented the numerous scam letters that flood the internet, the most common being the Nigerian who has inherited \$US10 million dollars and needs someone to help transfer the money.

The scam artists have spread out to other African countries, as well as the UK.

They have also expanded geographically, continually adding new twists to the letters.

Hotels are also victims to a variety of scams.

One popular scam is when a con artist makes a group booking and asks if the hotel can pay in advance for other transportation due to 'problems' paying from their home country.


Then, they use a stolen credit card and ask the hotel to send them cash via Western Union (non-returnable) for the other transportation charges to a tour agency.

Of course, it is the scam artist receiving the cash, and the next day the hotel gets the call from the bank revealing that the credit card is stolen and the charges are reversed.

The latest scam takes advantage of desperate real estate brokers who haven't seen any real business in many months. The scam artist pretends to make a large investment in a property or project and asks for the real estate agent to help with some up-front costs to transfer millions of dollars.

These letters are written to specific real estate brokers and are more sophisticated than the mass mailings seen in previous years.

So, a warning to all you real estate brokers: if it sounds too good to be true, then it probably is.







Haute cuisine meets country fare

o you wax excited over Phuket restaurants that ought to be considered for at least one-star honors in, say, the Guide Michelin?

I do. In this category must fit the well-known La Gaetana in Phuket Town, and perhaps the new Finnish-owned bistro, Pore Bar and Kitchen, in Chalong.

The author of an encyclopedic tome might have had Jacek Piasecki's menu at Pore in mind when he observed that "modern Finnish cuisine combines haute cuisine and country fare with contemporary continental cooking".

Jack, as he's better known, is a culinary school graduate, trained chef and three-time champion cocktail mixer of Finland.

Together with partners Janne Ajanti and Tommi Sjoblom, he opened Pore (pronounced 'por-ray') last October.

Jack oversees the restaurant, Janne, a professional caterer from Helsinki, is developing Pore's catering business, while Tommi, an artist in wood, has created the openair terrace restaurant's subtle blend of down-home ease and Egon Schiele-like sophistication.

Finns as a group are creative: their tertiary education ranks first in the world and they take out the largest number of patents, per capita, of all nations.

"Finns engage less in small talk and more in honest, straight-forward types of communication," notes the academic observer.

Thus Jack, author of Tips

From a Master Bartender, can be introspective; Janne more so; Tommi, though, just likes to have fun.

Marque Rome

"Are cocktails big in Finland?" my dinner companion wondered.

"Very. When we opened this restaurant I wanted something to reflect the place – the people, the culture, the hot climate – in a cocktail," he explained, setting before us two smoothies colored like sunset when Sumatran forests are aflame.

"I call it Junk Ceylon. What do you think?"

"I think it's darn potent," I said. It felt twice as strong as any ice-laden, fruit-laced cocktail should. "What's in it?"

"Papaya, passion fruit liqueur and," he paused, brows knitted. "Chili."

I thought the mix brilliantly conceived and unique, capturing Phuket's essence in a drink. How do you follow that? With a barbecue. Finns are big on barbecues and barbecuing ranks as a national pastime.

What first attracted my attention to Pore was the flagship barbecue dish; a 120cm-long plank covered with spare-ribs and 'all the trimmings' (1,000 baht).

"A guy came in and ate one himself," said Jack. "But he was pretty big."

We, alas, were but two, so we had the combo plate (800 baht), which might be enough for four.

Dinner began with the aforementioned cocktails and two cold appetizers (both 80 baht): Tuna Ceviche, comprising chunks of raw yellow fin tuna, garlic, pepper, rosemary and lime juice with whole-grain toast; and *Riimiharka*, a Finnish dish of raw, pickled sirloin steak, thinly sliced, accompanied by superb home-made potato salad and pickled cucumbers.

Riimiharka takes twentyfour hours to assemble. The raw sirloin must be first 'aged' a day, then rolled in spices and frozen, indirectly tenderizing the beef.

The potato salad bears

mention. Jack dresses his still-firm wedges of potato with homemade mayonnaise, oil and onions. Pore's pickles are home-made and the sauces, too.

Between courses we drank in the mise en scene. Tommi's bamboo-based interior architecture; a group of Scandinavian babes attracted by Pore's famous cocktails; the soundtrack, including the Beatles and the Stones; the roomy furniture – all good.

"Here is our combo plate," announced Jack, setting down a flat, two-foot long trencher piled with spare-ribs, pepper steak, grilled lamb chops and 'Chicken a la Jack'.

The spare-ribs were impossibly tender.

Side dishes included grilled vegetables, both scalloped and creamy mashed potatoes – the latter laced with garlic – and grilled tomatoes.

The steak featured creamy pepper sauces, the lamb a wine sauce, while the chicken was stuffed with mushrooms and bacon – all savory, aromatic, excellent.

Needless to say we were sated, but Jack wanted to show off more of his bar-tending skill.

I'd noticed he'd filled two flasks, one with a pale blue-green colored substance, the other cream colored.

These he carefully poured together into stemmed cocktail glasses and they arrived divided vertically into two colors.

"There's the Finnish flag for you," said Jack. "Blue and white." He actually calls the

creation 'Swan Lake'.

"How do you get the two fluids to stay that way?" asked my companion.

"The temperature, and the amounts of alcohol, sugar and crushed ice must be about the same and you can't leave the first part too long while mixing the second, otherwise they don't remain separated. That's rather a hard drink to make," he said.

Impressively hard – it won him one of his International Bartenders Association championships of Finland titles.


As a finale, Jack poured us all a Blue Blazer, announcing: "I'm not Jesus; I can't walk on water. But I'll make water burn."

Forthwith he flamed a sauce pan, filled largely with water, but including a potent liquor. This he poured into another sauce pan, back and forth, creating a blazing rainbow of fire, which spilled over two bottle-towers constructed for the purpose, then splashed into the waiting shot glasses. Everything blazed for a moment, growing hot. Finally, the fiery confection was handed out, and downed. "Woah! Potent," said someone. Jack smiled.

"Actually, it's just two centimeters of syrup and vodka: only the heat makes it seem stronger."

It's no wonder they used to call these mixologists 'professor' in the old days.

Separating the wheat from chaff

erhaps one night you have, like Byron, called for "hock and soda water" in your cups and then a pen wherewith to write; then writ and passed on to the parallel universe of sleep, dreaming of laurels to come.

Or, more likely, having sifted your own prose for meaning, you dismiss it as chaff and toss it to the termites.

If you fit either of these profiles, or any in between; if, in short, you like to write and are yet modest enough to think advice on your screed not unprofitable, and advice on marketing a positive boon you might join the Phuket Writer's Bloc.

The new club, brainchild of Bruce Stanley, whose penchant for wicked satire has been too often sublimated in reams of newsprint or chunks of virtual memory dedicated to detailing Phuket's seething Fashionistas, met for the first time recently at John Underwood's Art Factory, off the bypass road in tambon Rassada.

Roughly 20 persons of note and this writer showed up to schmooze, drink an excellent Chilean cab and listen to former Hollywood producer and director Edward Vaughn give pointers on the arcana of screen-writing – a subject more arcane than ever you imagined.

Underwood at his factory – more Colosseum than studio, more industrial than not – played host, throwing open the factory's new terrace restaurant, called The Works, to our party, who were all seated comfortably at a large, oblong table of four-inch teak.

Underwood's Works, I should add, his factory, and indeed its richly remunerative productions must be an inspiration to those who think nowhere is left on this, our universal Lego, for any but conforming sheep.

"I know it's the fashion among many to criticize, and find only fault," said Vaughan. "But if you want to write for the film industry, you have to love it," which is not, in his opinion, synonymous with extolling mediocrity.

"Talent will always be found," he said.

Vaughan's credentials, over a career spanning 32 years, include popular American TV series such as *Dragnet*, *Hunter*, *Vegas*, *The Waltons* and *Knots Landing*; he also worked on such films as *The Amityville Horror* and *Spitfire Grill*.

Many, I suppose, have heard the story of welfaremother J.K. Rowling, whose *Harry Potter* series "came fully formed" into her mind while on a four-hour-delayed train trip from Manchester to London in 1990.

Over the next five years, and in the course of many travails – losing her mother to multiple sclerosis, her husband, her job and very nearly losing her mind, forced to subsist on state handouts while raising her daughter – Rowling wrote Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone.

When it was finished, her publisher advised her to find another job because "writing children's books doesn't pay". Today, after a mere seven titles in the series, she is rich beyond the dreams of avarice – the first person to become a billionaire writing.

She has sold more books, faster, than anyone in history.

Except for an address at Harvard on "the importance of imagination", she has published nothing unrelated to Harry Potter and precious little outside the series itself.

Her publisher was wrong, she's made a fortune on children's books, and children's books alone!

Rowling is a prodigy, an extraordinary writer with extraordinary luck.

For the rest of us, however, Vaughan counsels that seemingly

petty yet important hurdles must be over leapt or one's efforts will pass unnoticed.

Hollywood agents and directors are seemingly more fussy than school-marms, obsessed not only that every 't' be crossed and every 'i' dotted, but that screenplays be written using the right ink, the right weight of paper and in a standardized 'final draft' form.

To ensure that Phuket's aspiring Hollywood screen-writers do not find themselves ripped-off before the joy of receiving a first rejection slip leaves its wrinkle upon their brows, Vaughan advised his audience to register scripts with the Writer's Guild of America (WGA) through the organiz-ation's website at www.wga.org.

"Some say you have to be ripped-off four or five times

before you can sell a script, but I don't think that's true," Vaughan averred.

Some, who exorcise their demons within the compass of a flickering quadrilateral, write as if impelled by nature, as if, from time to time, a little volcano inside erupts, pouring its lava through their veins, causing 'em to stab at the keys till another opus is finished or the eruption subsides.

They are 'artists' or 'authors' or anything you like so long as the 'a' is capitalized.

Others look at writing as an application merely of certain rules – economy of language, use of short sentences, simple tenses, common Anglo-Saxon derived words – to whatever topic flutters their editors' ganglia.

Such writers are rare, for the great mass has no more idea of what constitutes literary craftsmanship than your parrot.

The successful candidate will probably combine something of the former's seat-of-the-pants quality with the latter's practical cynicism.

Vaughan handed out a list of websites to his audience, each with tools useful to any Hollywood screenwriter, aspiring or veteran.

So, for example, imsdb.com has a database of scripts; its sister site imdb.com has full information on movies and movie people; inktip.com can help in marketing.

"Your average script is 125 pages long," Vaughan lectured.
"The key to getting one

"The key to getting one accepted is dramatic structure.

Basically, we are talking here about a three-act play: the first act introduces the characters; the second introduces a conflict; the third provides resolution and an emotionally satisfying ending.


"Anyone who doesn't understand dramatic structure, may as well go home."

But no one did; instead we watched a short European film. Finally the meeting broke up and we said our long goodbyes. Most in attendance found Vaughan's presentation enlightening.

"This is very practical," said Karl Matsumoto, a writer of children's books. "Everything we covered tonight is something I've wanted to do for years. I'm actually going to do my homework."

The fantastic Ferrari 458 Italia



he arrival of a new Ferrari is a special occasion, but one that re places the stunning 430 supercar must be somethingextremely special.

The 458 Italia is the latest incarnation of the mid-rear engined *Berlinetta* and will be unveiled at the next Frankfurt Motor Show in September.

While it's true that every Ferrari is innovative by definition, it is equally true that throughout the famous car maker's history at Maranello, certain cars have marked a genuine departure from the current range at the time.

This is very much the case with the Ferrari 458 Italia, which is a massive leap forward from the company's previous mid-rear engined sports cars.

The latest Ferrari is a completely new car from every point of view: engine, design. aerodynamics, handling, instrumentation and ergonomics.

The two-seater Italia benefits hugely from Michael Schumacher's input – now standard for all of Ferrari's road cars – based on his Formula One experience. Indeed, the Ferrari and F1 legend has been involved with the 458 Italia project right from the start.

The Italia boasts an innovative driving environment, featuring a new kind of steering wheel and dashboard that are both the direct result of racing practise.

The *Pininfarina* design provides further evidence of the complete departure from the past this new car demonstrates. The Italia has a compact, aerodynamic shape, underscoring

the concepts of simplicity, efficiency and lightness that inspired the project.

The front features a single opening for the front grille and side air intakes, with aerodynamic sections and profiles designed to direct air to the radiators and the new flat 'underbody'.

The nose also sports small aero-elastic winglets which generate downforce, deforming to reduce the section of the radiator inlets and cut drag as the speed of the car increases.

The new 5-litre V8 is the first Ferrari direct injection engine to be mid-rear mounted. It has a very low piston compression height, typical of racing engines, which contributes to its compression ratio of 12.5:1.

Equipped with the traditional flat-plane crankshaft, the engine delivers 570bhp at 9,000rpm, which sets a new benchmark, not only for the whole Ferrari range and the history of company, but also for the entire market segment.

Maximum torque is 540Nm at 6,000rpm, over 80 percent of which is available from 3,250rpm. This is all accompanied by a powerful growl that emerges from the three rear tailpipes.

The 458 Italia is equipped with a seven-speed, dual-clutch transmission, which increases performance while providing smooth shifts, even at full throttle.

The engineers have developed specific, 'sportier' gear ratios to match the power and torque curves of the new V8, guaranteeing high torque even at lower engine speeds and allowing the car to reach its maximum speed in top gear.

The Italia performs exceptionally, going from 0-100 km/h in just 3.4 seconds, with a top speed in excess of 325 km/h.

This new Ferrari is also a major leap forward when it comes to cutting emissions. Despite the fact that the new engine is significantly more powerful than the previous V8s, the 458 Italia produces just 320g/km of CO2.

An engine control unit governs the high-performance ABS, providing even more precise control over the logic threshold and greater efficiency.

The brakes also feature a pre-fill function, whereby the pistons in the callipers move the

pads into contact with the discs on lift off to minimize delay in the brakes being applied.

That, combined with the ABS, has cut the 100-0 km/h braking distance to a mere 32.5 meters.

The Ferrari 458 Italia will no

doubt have a queue of customers putting down deposits even before the Frankfurt unveiling, despite the fact that prices have yet to be announced.

Whatever it costs, though, it is a very welcome addition to the ranks of serious supercars.



The Andaman's sost tsunamis



he 2004 tsunami came as a terrible shock for local islanders and tourists alike. In the aftermath, Phuket hit the headlines across the globe and news agencies reported on the disaster for weeks as the event became one of the grimmest natural disasters in recent memory.

The high death toll throughout the region was partly blamed on a lack of knowledge and awareness about the initial warning signs of an impending tidal wave.

Unlike natural disasters such as cyclones – regular visitors to the region – Siamese historical records tell us nothing of any previous tsunamis, nor is the idea of the tidal wave embedded in any regional legend or folklore. Tell tale warning signs of the water retreating into the ocean alerted very few people on that fateful day.

The oceanic region around Phuket neighbors a much larger area known as the 'Pacific Ring of Fire'. The Ring of Fire is a horseshoe-shaped band stretching along the coastal areas of the Pacific Ocean. Some countries that lie on this band include the west coast of the United States, Japan and New Zealand.

Closer to home, the islands of Sumatra and Borneo are also located on the Ring of Fire. As much as 90 percent of the world's earthquakes and volcanic activity happens in that part of the world.

Whether we realized it or not, Phuket and other coastal areas along the Andaman had always been at risk of a disaster resulting from seismic activity.

Recent studies conducted by scientists from Chulalongkorn University have now revealed that the 2004 tsunami wasn't the first since humans first settled in the region.

According to Science Daily, the team working on Ko Phra Thong, an island 75 miles north of Phuket, discovered geological traces of previous tsunamis that have occurred on the Andaman coast.

The study showed that in the past 2,800 years, at least three tsunamis may have struck the area. Apart from the one in 2004, the most recent wave was thought to have hit this region around 550 to 700 years ago.

The team was able to create a rough timeline

documenting previous tsunamis thanks to an interesting geological method used on Ko Phra Thong. Working at different sites on the island, sub-teams dug holes and pits to study the sand deposits in the ground.

They found that the first layer was mostly white oceanic sand, which witnesses confirmed was deposited by the tsunami in 2004. Digging deeper, geologists reached another layer of wet, black soil. Digging past this second layer uncovered yet another layer of white oceanic sand. It was concluded that this layer was brought inshore by a previous tsunami prior to December 2004.

Carbon dating of tree bark found in the soil revealed this tsunami probably hit the region between 1300 and 1450 AD.

The findings show that although tsunamis have happened in the Andaman before prior to 2004, they are not frequent phenomena in this region, occurring perhaps once every millennium!

Perhaps this helps to explain why we don't witness any cultural awareness of tsunamis in the region. Compared to Japan and Hawaii where tsunami awareness is high because of their frequency, coastal societies in our Andaman region seemed completely oblivious to the idea of a tsunami,

at least on a cultural level.

There are no local legends about tsunamis and no known historical accounts have been found. If the estimations calculated by geologists on Ko Phra Thong are correct, it would mean the tsunami prior to 2004 would have struck a civilization that predated even the first Siamese Kingdom.

In a continually changing region where civilizations have risen and declined, and where cultures, languages, religions and people have been subject to continuous change, it's not surprising that records about such rare phenomenon haven't survived.

However, when a giant wave strikes, it wreaks unimaginable havoc. This is perhaps the reason why tsunamis have captured the imaginations of certain ancient aboriginal cultures and coastal tribesmen further afield.

The aboriginal sea tribes who inhabit the Andaman and Nicobar Islands nearly 500 miles west of Phuket have sustained a local myth about a 'giant wave that eats people' for centuries, passing it down verbally from generation to generation.

Yet within these folktales, there lies local wisdom about


heeding the warnings of an impending disaster. According to the myth, seven waves were brought by the angry spirits of their tribe's ancestors and their wrath could only be avoided by immediately fleeing to high ground if they noticed the ocean starting to retreat.


These ancient communities still exist today in relative isolation on the Andaman Islands. Days after the 2004 tsunami, Indian authorities were hovering over one of the Andaman Islands in a helicopter, assessing the damage, when they discovered about 500 aboriginal inhabitants of sea villages who had taken refuge in the hills. Apparently they had moved to higher ground minutes before the wave struck and survived.

The tribes-people had lived on the islands for centuries, almost untouched by time and development. When a tribesman was asked about the incident and how they knew of the impending disaster, he replied that their forefathers had warned, "When the earth shakes, the sea will rise up to the land". Because of this, they knew they had to run to higher ground if they wanted to survive.

Such aboriginal communities may have been widespread throughout the Andaman archipelago centuries ago, but most have long since disappeared. The tribes had no system of writing, therefore no written history can be passed down.

Their knowledge about tsunamis relied on myths communicated verbally as the medium to pass down such information, but when the tribal communities disappeared, so did their stories

Franky Gun

Franky Gun is well known in Phuket for his many contributions to the tourism industry. He's lived in Thailand since 1991 and has worked in the dive industry and the graphic design business. He also contributed cartoons as well as a regular column to the *Phuket Gazette* for seven years.

And now he runs his own property management business in Khao Lak, about an hour's drive north of Phuket.

He grew up in Bochum, near Cologne in the western region of Germany, and after completing his secondary education took an apprenticeship to learn the skills of a goldsmith. Except for four years spent in the German army as a tank commander, Franky worked repairing gold jewelry until he came to Thailand.

By 1991, the 26-year-old Franky had a wife, two young children and a promising career. Then a sudden and traumatic divorce struck him, causing a friend at work to insist that he take a holiday to Thailand to get some peace of mind.

"I had never been to Asia. After a short stay in Thailand, I knew that I needed to make a new life as my life in Germany had changed, and as happens to so many visiting foreigners, Thailand seemed very open and free [to me], so I decided to move here."

With a contact from a friend, Franky moved to nearby Trang province and got a job as a jungle guide, taking visitors to explore the province's many caves. He also got his PADI certification and became an underwater dive instructor.

"One day I was taking some guests to Koh Ngai and our boat capsized. I was trapped underwater, but after a lot of struggle I was able to reach the surface. Fortunately, we were all saved after swimming for some hours to a nearby island."

It would not be the last time that Franky would be trapped underwater.

He then moved to Koh Lanta where he opened that island's first dive center. But the remote isolation proved unsuitable for him so he moved to Phuket where he worked for Santana Divers and then Dive Asia.

In his free time, Franky experimented with painting. He opened his own art gallery at Kata Center, a business which subsequently grew into the popular Voodoo Pub.

In 1994, with his partner Stephan Fischer, Franky launched Calypso Divers, named after Jacque Cousteau's boat.

At about this time, he created *Arthur's Wildest Years*, a very popular series of cartoons

in the *Phuket Gazette* in which he portrayed the dire mishaps and follies of a rather basic 'older' *farrang* trying to succeed as an aspiring expat resident of the Phuket of 15 years ago.

He continued to develop his artistic talents by learning computer programs which allowed him to create graphics and marketing materials, primarily for Phuket's dive industry.

By 2000, Franky was looking for new horizons. A friend introduced him to the beauty of the beaches at Khao Lak.

"I love the idea of pioneering new places where things are still evolving and where there are new possibilities," he says.


He bought a piece of land on the beach and built a house. But in 2004 the tsunami swept him out of that home and pushed the entire structure underwater and into a nearby bungalow. He survived in the fight for his life, but his parents, who were visiting from Germany at the time, both perished.

"Even though I lost everything, I was lucky that my pregnant wife was not at home. The birth of our new son, Martin, helped me to get a new grip on life."

Today, Franky is happy running his property development company, Land House Pool, which handles all aspects of construction, from design to sales.

Despite enduring the tragedy at Khao Lak, he now considers it his permanent home.

The long road to recovery

he Royal Bank of Scotland (RBS) became somewhat infamous during the 'credit crunch' for becoming a disaster when it was once a stellar performer.

It also achieved the dubious distinction of recording the worst annual loss by any company in British history.

However, not all the staff at RBS are noted for 'bad timing'.

One such noted exception is RBS chief credit strategist Bob Janjuah who is highly regarded in financial circles.

He correctly predicted the outcome of the dangerous excesses of the credit bubble and was in a decided minority when he predicted the possibility of a global crash in mid-2008.

His predictions included a warning, forecasting 'a very nasty period will soon be upon us.'

History shows he hit the proverbial nail on the head when Lehman Brothers collapsed and was shortly followed by a wave of others that threatened the global financial system.

Well, Mr Janjuah is at it again, predicting we are going to see a nasty second round of selling.

This, he states, will take the Standard & Poors 500 index in the US to the mid 500s – even lower than when it bottomed out in early March this year.

analysts have commented that the the US was not showing sufficient 'Footsie' in the UK will fall to around 2,500.

Mr Janjuah poses the question, "Who bails out the governments after they have bailed out everyone else?"

In particular, he is referring to the governments of the US and the UK.

He believes these governments may be able to postpone a wipe out this year with the aid of more major stimuli, but then sees the 'day of reckoning' only being postponed until middle of 2010.

His recommendation: buy 10-year German government bonds.

Certainly, there are others who see doom and gloom for markets ahead including technical analysts who note the sharp rise in markets since early March 2009.

Apparently, the markets have risen at the fastest pace since the great depression of the 1930s, but this doesn't mean this rise is anything but a major ' bear market' rally that will end in tears.

The rise in market prices in the period since March has been welcomed as a huge 'relief rally', given the fact that the end of the world, financially speaking, has not occurred.

By mid-August, there were

signs of economic recovery to justify any continuation of the rally.

Huge stimulus packages around the world have enabled the economic situation to appear more positive than it really is and as governments cannot continue to pump money into the system indefinitely, what happens thereafter?

We are really in unchartered territory as never before have governments around the world simultaneously poured such huge sums of money into their respective economies.

In addition, inventories were at very low levels by March and a significant portion of demand has been generated simply by restocking at something approaching normal levels.

Some observers will comment that history does have one example of multi-government stimuli on a massive scale -World War Two.

A number of economists and analysts described it as the 'largest public works program in history.'

However, this is peace time and a different situation exists.

Mr Janjuah's theory could prove to be true but if it does, the investment of choice might not be 10-year German government bonds, but futures funds.

When a trend is clearly on the slide, a lot of money can be made in futures markets. In 2008 when markets

were crashing, many futures

funds made large profits. Hedge funds can also profit in that type of environment, but it requires rigorous analysis to pick

the right type of hedge fund. In spite of the doommongers, many market participants have a more positive outlook.

One is Teun Draaisma, an equity specialist at Morgan Stanley, who believes we have seen the worst.

"We were on course for a great depression in February, but Armageddon was avoided. Governments did not repeat the policy errors of the 1930s," he said.

Mr Draaisma correctly predicted the peak of equity prices in 2007 and his timing was impeccable.

Now be believes this is a genuine rebound rally that has much further to go and although he also predicts a nasty correction, it won't be in the near future.

He believes the danger point will be when conditions are improving and central banks start talking in a hawkish manner typically about two months before actually raising interest rates.

Another equity bull is Rupert Watson, asset allocation strategist at Royal Skandia, who

commented, "To understand why it's such a good time to increase exposure to equities, it's important to understand why the last 10 years have been so poor."

There were two main reasons for this.

Firstly, equities were overpriced at the end of the 1990s. The price-to-earnings ratio (P/E ratio) on the major stock indices reached an all time high in the late '90s, over twice the historical average.

Thus, the price investors were paying to buy into the equity market was the highest it had ever been.

Secondly, the financial crisis and subsequent global recession led to sharp falls in equity markets in 2008 as earnings, confidence and risk appetite nosedived.

"From a multi-year perspective, now is a good time to be buying equities as they are cheap. US and UK equities are at their lowest P/E ratio in almost 20 years and lower than their long-term average," Watson added.

Certainly, equities are cheap in relation to bonds – cash is yielding minimal returns and there are huge amounts of cash sitting on the sidelines.

It is a fact that most institutional and retail investors missed the rally that started in March.

The technique of cost averaging – investing on a regular basis – is still going to be the safest approach to markets.

Equities are relatively cheap, but there is still the risk they will become cheaper still.

Investors are faced with the old dilemma of 'greed versus fear of loss'.

There is still bad news lurking in the background but if markets start to produce some optimism, bad news will be ignored, although the reverse is true if pessimism rules.

Unfortunately, saying 'the glass is half full' or 'the glass is half empty' does not mean a change in amount, only a change in perception.



Nature punishing man's folly

Developments in recent weeks underscore the need for better engineering design when planning construction projects on the island.

Phuket was able to withstand centuries of tin mining with enough of its natural beauty intact to subsequently develop into a world-class tourist destination.

Yet as destructive as tin mining was, its legacy has been no match for the environmental destruction that has resulted from the poorly regulated development of the island as a tourist destination.

Man may appear to have emerged the 'winner' following the island's last great clash with nature: the earthquake that caused the 2004 tsunami disaster.

Areas that celebrated a somber and dumbstruck New Year's Eve 2004 with no electricity after unthinkable losses in human life and property are now back to their 'former glory'.

Tailor shops, trinket stalls and massage parlors once again occupy every square meter of available space in popular tourist areas, with only the odd arson attack or shootout to put pause to commerce.

The tsunami that flattened Patong less than five years ago is now only marked by the presence of commemorative tsunami videos and magazines which compete for space on vendors' stalls with pirated DVDs.

The forces of nature have not given up the fight, however.

We recently saw monsoon-season currents obliterate – or at least bury – much of the Coral Reef Squadron artificial reef project in Bang Tao Bay.

Back on dry land, a large sinkhole suddenly appeared on the Patong side of hilly Phra Barami Road last week, nearly gobbling up Patong Mayor Pian Keesin as he passed in his car.

The fate of the Coral Reef Squadron and Patong Hill road, both predicted in this space, are just two examples of the kind of inadequate engineering design found all over the island.

In the case of the artificial reef, it is hard not to feel sorry for the many groups that made the project happen, as it was an experimental project driven largely by unselfish motives.

Still, from an engineering standpoint, the idea of dropping objects designed for lift in a light fluid (air) into a much denser fluid (water) should have prompted better testing prior to deployment.

Less sympathy can be felt for those responsible for the Patong Hill sinkhole, which was a disaster waiting to happen.

Ironically, Mr Pian is an outspoken proponent of building a tunnel under the same said hill and relaxing the provincial statute that forbids development of land over 80 meters.

It will be interesting to see how his recent experience and the recent flooding in Patong shifts his perspective on these policies, if at all.

Whose bell is it anyway?

n the weeks leading up to the submission of the redshirts' petition on behalf of former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, some surprising things were said and written.

We were told repeatedly by political figures, academics and media contributors that the petition was illegal and improper, that those signing it might be liable to prosecution for lese majeste or contempt of court (one general suggested the death penalty), and that the whole exercise was counter to law, tradition, convention and proper 'Thai' behavior.

But Section 59 of the current constitution states:

"A person shall have the right to present a petition and to be informed about the result of

its consideration within the appropriate time.'

And Section 187 states:

King has the prerogative to grant a pardon.'

It does not matter what the criminal code says about the proper procedure for petitions on specific issues. The right to submit a petition is an absolute right governed by the constitution.

The 1997 constitution

"A person shall have the right to present a petition and to be informed of the result of its consideration within the appropriate time, as provided by law.'

The final clause in this 1997 version did make it appear that this right was conditional on other laws. But the drafters of the 2007 constitution, appointed by the coup generals, removed this trailing clause for greater clarity.

In the 2007 version, the right to present a petition is an absolute right, without qualification. And the royal prerogative is totally unconditional.

Could it be that most journalists and broadcasters. several permanent secretaries, the rectors of major universities, almost the entire academic staff of Chulalongkorn University, and the prime minister are unaware of these provisions in the constitution? Probably not.

Could it be that several of those who claimed the Thaksin petition is illegal, immoral, improper, distasteful and devious have forgotten that they signed a petition three years ago calling on the monarch to remove Thaksin from office under Section 7 of the constitution? Probably not.

Yet the distinguished political scientist who led the delegation

> that handdelivered that petition to the palace March 2006 has been among those decrying the

latest pro-Thaksin petition.

Make no mistake. Chang Noi thinks that Thaksin does not deserve a pardon, and indeed should be punished for his major crimes. But the opposition to the petition raised issues of principle, history and practical politics.

More interestingly, many of those who felt moved to publicly oppose the Thaksin petition are precisely those people who regularly point to the right of petition as one proof that Thailand is a better democracy as a result of being a democracy with a constitutional monarchy.

The fundamental text for this argument is 'Inscription One', claimed to have been authored by King Ramkhamhaeng of Sukhothai in the 13th century. The inscription lists several claims for Ramkhamhaeng's enlightened rule, including:



ANTI-THAKSIN BRIGADE: Could it be that several of those who claimed the Thaksin petition is illegal and immoral have forgotten that they signed a petition three years ago calling to remove Thaksin from office under Section 7 of the constitution? Probably not.

"He has hung a bell in the opening of the gate over there; if any commoner in the land has a grievance which sickens his belly and gripes his heart, and which he wants to make known to his ruler and lord, it is easy; he goes and strikes the bell which the King has hung there. King Ramkhamhaeng, the ruler of the kingdom, hears the call; he goes and questions the man, examines the case, and decides justly for him. So the people of this city of Sukhothai praise him."

For over 60 years, this excerpt from the inscription has been repeatedly quoted to support the idea that there has been a unique 'Thai system of government' down through the ages.

In 1946, Prince Dhani Nivat argued that the bell proved the Thai monarch was always "accessible to the people", and this method of calling for redress "survived with slight modifications all through the centuries down to the change of regime in 1932".

A few years later, Kukrit Pramoj cited the bell as central to

his argument that "this Thai system of government is good," and has always been good. He repeated the quotation time and again through his long career as politician and publicist, eventually claiming the bell and the right of petition were proof that liberalism, democracy and monarchy were bound together in Thai tradition for 700 years.

Countless others have followed suit in using Ramkhamhaeng's bell as symbol and proof of the specialness and value of this tradition.

What is fascinating is that many of the people opposing the Thaksin petition were exactly the sort of people who normally love to cite the example of the bell. Of course, in opposing the petition, they tried to add some conditional arguments.

They said that in this case the bell was being used in the wrong way; the bell was being used with bad intentions; the bell was being used illegally. They seem to have forgotten that the key point of the original line in the inscription is that the bell is totally without conditions:

"If any commoner in the land has a grievance ... he goes and strikes the bell."

They seem to have forgotten that it was the simplicity and universality of the bell that made it so attractive to Prince Dhani, Kukrit and others of similar mind as proof that "this Thai system of government is good."

Over the last two years, we have got used to seeing the pillars of Thai democracy undermined for short-term reasons, but it is still surprising to see one of the foundations of the conservative tradition treated in the same way.

But the most important point concerns the political consequences of this outcry against the petition in the context of today's delicate political tensions.

Because supporters of Thaksin who remember the simple old argument of the bell and who cannot follow the subtle conditionalities introduced by political scientists, leader writers, university rectors and permanent secretaries, will probably assume that what they are really being told is: the bell is for us, not for you.

The toughest teacher in town

ophie Cox is a P.E. teacher at the recently opened Phuket International Academy but the path she has taken to teach Phuket's youngsters is an unorthodox one.

As a former British judo champion, Sophie competed at the highest level, representing Great Britain at the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece.

Sophie, from Rochdale, first started judo at the age of seven because her parents thought it would keep her out of trouble.

A talented judoka, she would go on to become British Champion at >57kgs, a title she would hold for six years before walking away from the sport after the Athens Olympics.

Sophie also competed in several European Championships, winning three silver medals and one bronze.

Sophie, who had a reputation for being a gritty competitor, narrowly missed out on a gold medal at the 2004 European Championships when she was defeated by reigning Olympic Champion Isabel Fernandez, despite dominating the majority of the bout.

Two years later, Sophie decided to end her judo career.

and it was another two years until the next Olympics which would have been a major commitment," she said.

However, years of competing overseas had given her a

"When I was training full time we used to travel all over Europe. I also went to Japan and competed at the World University Games where our team won the silver medal," she said.

Soon after retiring, Sophie ended up in Phuket and decided she didn't want to leave.

"I started teaching English just as a means to be able to stay in Thailand," she said.

"I was working at the British International School and then I got a job at Chalerm Prakiat teaching Physical Education and English."

This gave Sophie the opportunity to start teaching judo and she is keen to share some of her vast experience with people in Phuket.

"I'd like to start introducing judo to the local community. It's not that big in Thailand, but they do compete in judo at the Southeast Asian Games," Sophie said.

"The International Academy is going to have elite academies "The center I was at folded for swimming and tennis and I am

hoping to add judo."

Sophie, who got her black belt aged 15, believes judo is a great sport to learn, regardless of age.

"It keeps you fit and healthy and teaches you discipline. It also teaches you to handle yourself and makes you more aware of what you can and can't do," she said.

"I know people who have been attacked and successfully defended themselves with judo and a lot of bouncers learn it for that reason."

Judo isn't Sophie's only claim to fame. She holds a place in the Guinness Book of Records as the first ever woman to play rugby league at Wembley when her school team played an exhibition match before the rugby league final in 1993.

Despite having such an impressive career behind her, Sophie is still only 27 and admits to missing competing.

"I don't do any competitive sport at the moment, only teaching and training. I do miss the competition, but it would be difficult to get back into," she said.

"I don't know how my body would feel about me training full time again, but I would like to get into mixed martial arts."

Sophie is not quite ready to walk away from the sport which

"While this may be true in many areas of Phuket, you don't have to look far to find great biking. The north east of Phuket offers some nice trails and roads with much less traffic.

"If you go inland where there is less development because of the terrain, it is very mountainous and there are some fantastic trails, but they can be difficult to find," he said

s part of a concerted effort to get more Thai youngsters involved in sailing in Phuket, a group of children from the Verasatri Anvsorn School in Pa Khlok took part in a three-day sailing course last week.

Phuket ready to send 155 athletes to Trang Games

The Sports Authority Thailand Phuket will send a 155-strong team of athletes to compete in the Trang Games, which commence later this month.

This year will mark the 38th staging of the games. The multisport event is being contested under the theme of 'Spirit and Friendship', which organizers hope will produce a competitive atmosphere, but with a sense of camaraderie and fair play among the participants.


Over the course of the 11-day event, the Phuket team will compete in a total of 19 different sports, including track and field, badminton, futsal, *takraw*, taekwando, swimming and indoor volleyball. Most of the Phuket competitors are confident of finishing in the medals.

Comprising 18 athletes, the track and field team is the largest of the squad. However, the boxing team consists of a single competitor.

The Phuket team is being led by Mr Virat Phatee, Director of the Sports Authority Thailand Phuket. Another 35 officials will also accompany the team to help with organizing and co-ordinating the athletes

The team will leave Phuket for Trang on September 7, giving the athletes a chance to finalize their preparations before the event gets underway two days later on September 9.

FIFA president to open memorial football center



Joesph 'Sepp' Blatter is the eighth president of FIFA.

IFA President Joseph 'Sepp' Blatter is set to visit Phuket next month as part of a whistlestop three-day visit to Thai land. Mr Blatter will arrive in Phuket on September 15 to participate in the grand opening ceremony of the Tsunami Memorial Football Center with Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisangop before heading to Bangkok.

Mr Blatter's arrival on Phuket will mark the culmination of a project that began in 2005.

Built at the Baan Ao Nam Bor School near Ao Makham, the center, which consists of two football pitches and three buildings, cost 35 million baht.

The sum was donated by FIFA's Tsunami Task Force, which was established in the wake of the December 2004 disaster.

Following his stopover in Phuket, Mr Blatter will head to Bangkok, where he is scheduled to meet Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva for dinner.

On September 16, Mr Blatter will attend the grand opening of an Astroturf pitch in the capital, before visiting the new Thai Football Association headquarters.

Members of the Thai FA will hold a farewell party for Mr Blatter before he flies back to Switzerland later that night.

Mr Blatter is the eighth president of FIFA having succeeded Brazilian Dr Joao Havelange in 1998.



Going back to your roots

Spicing things up part two: roots



ecently I went in search of spice seeds to photograph. I needed them for pictures that could accompany my scribblings about herbs and spices, and, in addition, to try out in the garden.

I found more than I had bargained for, including such exotic stuff as dried butterfly pea flowers (clitoria ternata), liquorice root, star anise and fenugreek. Not the everyday flavorings I am writing about today, but it reinforces the point I have made before: there is no end to the cornucopia of flavors we are lucky enough to savor in Thailand.

Today, however, I'm rooting for roots. The most powerfully pungent bulbs in Southeast Asia, as in most corners of the globe, belong to the lily (*liliaceae*) family and of all these – onions, shallots, chives and garlic - the latter (allium sativum) is the most commonly used.

A daily task, as any Thai 'restaurateur' will confirm, is to peel all those pesky 'kratiem' bulbs. More than one type of garlic grows here. The small purple-skinned cloves are cheapest Thai eateries, but is considered superior to the white ones on account of their greater intensity of flavor. Packed with oil, they will surely let your taste buds know if you are bold enough to chomp them up raw as so many Thais do...

More commonly, the cloves are macerated into a spicy paste along with other seasonings, or chopped and added to stir-fry dishes, soups and stews, or sliced and fried to a brown crisp with fish.

I went through an entire childhood without ever tasting garlic. Hard to imagine, especially in this day and age when garlic has become one of those 'magical' natural ingredients, supposedly capable of thinning the blood, of reducing 'bad' cholesterol and of lowering vascular pressure.

And if you do try putting some bulbs in the garden, they do have an inhibiting effect on many pests. They won't come within a mile. That much I know from growing garlic in Andalucia.

I hope we can pass quickly over the onion (allium) 'per se'. It is one of the oldest vegetables known to man, and while I love them as much as Chaucer's Summoner, whose fourteenth century breath was permanently be-fouled by onions, they are so cheap here – eight baht a kilo at the last count for the white variety and their appearance and flavor so well known, that they don't need me to expatiate upon their merits.

The spring onion (allium fistulosum or ton tom) is a very important garnish in the Kingdom. It is not only found in those green platters of winged beans, Chinese kale and cashew leaves that grace the lunch tables of the

often added, along with garlic, to the clear soups that accompany the main course.

Although shallots (allium ascolonicum or hom daeng) grow wild in parts of Thailand, they are a less visible presence because they are not used for decorative effect. But they are common ingredients in hot pastes, and are sometimes preferred to onions on account of their sweeter and less harsh flavor, plus they have a lower water content that allows for easier frying.

If you try growing them, remember that they don't grow singly like onions, but in small bunches. They are best cultivated in rich soil from 'sets' of small bulbs, rather than from seed. Remember to pare away the earth from the tops of the bulbs once they are well established.

The last member of the allium clan to warrant a mention is the chive (allium tuberosum), normally referred to in the plural form. Bunches of the local variety, flat or Chinese chives, are readily available in local markets.

They grow in long-leaved clusters and, because of their strong aroma, are sometimes known as 'garlic chives'. Often sold with the flowering tips (or culm) still attached, they are considered a delicacy in Chinese cuisine. Equally, ask any Thai about 'dok kuichai' and they will soon be singing its praises.

So what about spicy roots? Two, ginger and galangal, cannot be ignored, despite recent official attempts to curtail their use as pesticides and while both have both been briefly defended in these columns before, they deserve a proper mention.

Ginger (zingiber officinale) is, of course, better known abroad, since the mature, beigecolored root travels well and is available from any European greengrocer. Known as 'khing' in Thailand, where it grows wild what doesn't? – it is normally sold in markets as a freshly dug young root. In this form, it has thin, creamy skin and pink shoots which terminate in green stalks You can easily pop a couple in some moist soil to start your own crop.

Popular as a marinade with Chinese chefs or as an accompaniment to fried fish, the tender young roots can be grated or crushed to release the intense flavor before cooking.

Ginger has a reputation in Asia as a medicinal herb, useful for counteracting indigestion and even nausea. It also makes a delectable hot drink which I often buy - in a plastic bag of course – at the local market. Good for hangovers...

Galangal (alipinia galanga) comes from the same family and the rhizome looks quite similar, if less knobbly.

But the flavor is distinctively different and, sliced into thin chunks, the tough fibrous root graces many Thai and Malay soups and stews. The sour, slightly citrus flavor of tom yam soup owes everything to its infusion of galangal.

Like ginger, it is an attractive addition to the kitchen garden. Plant a rhizome and it will sprout sword-like leaves and, whisper it softly, some Thais believe galangal has aphrodisiacal powers...

The low-down on rental agreements

ore and more foreigners are making the leap and purchasing property in Thailand.

This can be for various reason, including buying a holiday home, having a place in which to live once retired or simply as an investment.

In order to attract the attention of potential buyers, many developers offer different rental schemes such as rental pools or guaranteed rental returns.

Guaranteed rental return programs are the hot favorite in Thailand today and are used as a marketing tool in order to grab the buyer's attention.

Many buyers feel safer investing in properties if it comes with a guarantee of receiving a fixed income for an agreed period of time. It offers a hassle-free opportunity to generate income with the added bonus that responsibilities can be left with the developer or its management company.

Whenever a buyer considers investing in such property, it is vitally important to carefully review the entire sales documentation provided by the developer, including the legal agreements to be executed.

Don't be duped by glossy marketing materials and bro-

chures that create a great first impression of the property, but won't suffice in detailing the intracies of the rental agreement.

A comprehensive description of the applicable terms and conditions, including rental guarantee is required.

In regard to guaranteed rental returns, a buyer may consider the following major points.

Firstly, the legal structure of a guaranteed rental return scheme needs to be carefully examined in order to determine if such a guarantee is subject to certain terms and conditions and details 'if, when, and how' such rental payments shall be paid. In addition, it should be verified under what conditions a buyer may occupy the property for private use during the guaranteed rental period.

At this point, the 'opt-out' scenario should be factored into your thoughts.

You should also consider whether the guarantee is assignable in case of a property resale, what solutions are available in the event the guarantee is breached and what tax liabilities are imposed on rental income.

Furthermore, as a buyer you should verify the financial stability of the contractual party who

promises guaranteed rental payments. A guarantee is only as stable as your contractual party is. In this context, a developer's financial background and proven record in rental management should be examined.

The second major point to consider is that a rental guarantee might not be genuine. It might be nothing more than a partial repayment in instalments of an overpriced property from the developer to the purchaser.

In other words, the payments under the guaranteed scheme are simply written into the price of the property. Therefore, it is advisable to

compare the purchase price of your property with properties of a similiar design, construction quality and location in order to determine whether the price of your property reflects the true market value.

If such guaranteed rental return is not of interest, then a developer could be approached to request a price reduction equaling the amount received under the rental program.

It is also important to remember that as a buyer, every guarantee has a price. If the risks are lower, the return will be lower.

A developer will only agree to provide guaranteed rental return if the promised return is low enough to allow them to rent out the property for a higher amount and keep the balance.

Considering these points, rental schemes, guaranteed rental programs or rental pools might be an interesting investment but exercise due dilligence in your choice.

Keeping sand wash ship shape



often get asked about how to maintain sand wash. There are many things to consider if you want to keep it in good shape for long time.

After proper installation, you will be left with a lovely surface, but you should be aware that cement is an open, porous surface and will absorb all kinds of liquids.

Sand wash is typically laid before the development is finished, which means that there are many more jobs to be completed before your property is finished.

After construction is completed, there is every chance that your dream surface has the appearance of a kid's play area and is covered in cement spills, timber acids, paint spots and thinner among other things, and you might ask why nobody has applied a sealant on the surface.

you around 350 baht per square meter and a sealant can be a costly addition.

Starting at 50 baht for a short-term silicone sealant, the higher quality sealants might cost the same as the sand wash itself.

It could end up costing twice the price of the sand wash because you might need to use a professional cleaning service before applying the sealant.

If you think about using sand wash for your home, you should factor in a the cost of a quality sealant into your budget.

The biggest disadvantage of sand wash is its uneven surface structure.

It will give you grip when applied around the swimming pool, but when the wet season starts you will always get a 'biofilm' on the surface, resulting in a layer of mold and algae growing out of the microscopic capillaries in the cement

After a while, all you will be left with is an ugly, dark green surface.

The local way to get rid of this mess is to give it a chlorine or acid wash to destroy the bio A sand wash might cost mass and then use a high-

pressure washer to get rid of the accumulation on the surface.

This is the beginning of the end of your nice sand wash.

Using a high-powered

water spray will break up the surface of the sand wash even more, resulting in more pores and the return of the mold and algae even sooner.

The chlorine and acid is harmful to the cement, and with each pressure wash you remove layer upon layer of the cement until the little stones lose adhesion in the cement bed and simply fall out.

The death of your sand wash is now inevitable.

With ongoing acid washing you will also destroy the surrounding environment, this is why reducing maintenance for sand wash was one of our main areas of research in advanced cleaning technologies.

The most advanced coating technology in mold prevention is the Photocoat TiO2, which was discussed in the last *Homeworks* column.

Optionally, there is a wide range of sealants available in local hardware stores if you want to do it yourself or there are the services offered by many sand wash or stone care companies.

Here is a short overview:

Silicone sealants are the cheapest sealants and will put a film-like water-repellent coating on the surface, protecting the surface from water penetration.

The silicone often contains some chemicals added to slow down mold growth, but the coating is affected by the sun's UV rays and will eventually break down.

Pressure washing can be reduced, but it must still be done from time to time to get rid of the algae and dirt. Again, this will remove the coating over time.

The silicone coating needs to be reapplied at least every two years. Prices range form 50 to 100 baht per square meter.

Resin or acrylic coatings are medium-price coatings, producing a lacquered-like finish which can often make the surface slippery. They are also affected by UV rays and will be removed by pressure washing, but will last a bit longer than silicone. Price range: 100-150 baht per square meter.

Polysiloxan or similar concrete crystallization solutions permanently close the tiny capillaries in the cement.

This is beneficial to the cement substrate as water can not pass through the surface layer and the reinforced steel will be protected from corrosion.

In addition, the cement structure is much harder and high-pressure washing cannot destroy the cement. Price range: 100-200 baht per square meter, depending on the features.


If you already have a sealed surface, I recommend spraying a mold inhibitor on the surface occasionally, keeping damage from pressure washing to a minimum.

An application of vinegar mixed with water will do a good job of preventing corrosion as well, while replacing the chlorine or acid wash with a combination of Oxy bleach and water is highly recommended.

Simply spray it on the sand wash and wait 15 minutes before brushing and rinsing.

The mold will be destroyed and it is not detrimental to the environment.

Bt3.5bn in Phuket villa sales

ransactions in Phuket's luxury villa market topped 3.5 billion baht in the first half of 2009, according to figures recently released by Phuket-based property and hospitality consulting firm c9 Hotelworks.

The report, 'Luxury Villa Market Update Mid-year Edition', defines luxury villas in Phuket as those with price tags of 65 million baht (approx US\$ 1.9 million) and above.

It also puts the value of the island's

current inventory of such villas at 10 billion baht – with 19 of the top-end properties having been sold between January and June, and 92 units currently for sale.

According to the report, resales of luxury villas are becoming a significant segment, with over 1 billion baht in transactions by mid year.

High-end products are outperforming the broader market, despite recovery prospects for the overall property market having been set back to 2011.
