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Paiboon cleared of vote-buying charges

AIBOON Upatising, president of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO), was cleared of votebuying in a ruling by the Appeals Court in Bangkok on Tuesday.

He received a hero's welcome at Phuket International Airport the next morning.

Mobbed by at least 300 supporters, many dressed in pink shirts – Mr Paiboon's campaign color – he thanked the crowds for their support.

"I worked and campaigned honestly the whole time, but I was the victim of people playing politics," he said. "I'm like a diamond that got covered in mud - now I'm shiny again.'

The PPAO president, who has been suspended from his duties since May, said he would be heading straight back to work.

Mr Paiboon said he resented losing four months of work due to people he called 'slanderers', but would do his best to deliver on his campaign promises during the remaining three years of his four-year term.

"I don't have time for revenge," he said. "I'd rather get back to work for my brothers and sisters in Phuket."

The verdict overturned a 'yellow card' ruling by the Election Commission, which found there was sufficient evidence against Mr Paiboon and another PPAO candidate, Sawat Muchawej, to indicate their election wins were aided by electoral fraud.

The court also overturned the ruling against Mr Sawat.




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Green light for Bt2bn conference center

HUKET will receive a wo billion baht central government budget next fiscal year to build the long-awaited international convention and exhibition center

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(ICEC) at the island's northern tip, the Prime Minister's Office has announced.

Anchalee Vanich-Thepabutr, who currently serves as Deputy Secretary of the Office of the Prime Minister's political affairs section, made the announcement in a press release issued by Phuket Provincial Hall.

The funding will form part phase two of the government's 100-billion-baht 'Strong Thai Action Plan 2012' stimulus package, aimed at shoring up the Thai economy.

Terms of the spending plan are still under review by Parliament, but final approval is expected prior to the start of fiscal 2010, which begins on October 1, 2009.

The site of the project will be a 150-rai plot of seaside land in Tah Chat Chai on the northern tip of the island.

Plans for an ICEC to help support the island's hotel industry have been around for decades, but political instability and infighting over where the project should be located have prevented the dream from ever becoming reality.

Detractors with business interests in the more developed southern part of the island feel the location is too remote from the island's main population center.

Proponents say the ICEC will help develop nearby parts of Phang Nga as well as Mai Khao, which is already home to Phuket International Airport and is slated to become the site of Police Region 8 headquarters in a few years' time.

Revelers were searched for drugs and weapons and subjected to urine testing.

Their identification papers

were over 18 years old.

Not one was found to be breaking the law.

Gov Wichai said random searches were nevertheless crucial in the fight against crime.

"There are more than 300,000 people registered as living here, as well as a lot of tourists and foreign workers," he said.

"Our 1,000 police officers and 70 volunteers just aren't enough to check all the entertainment venues."

"That's why we carry out random searches," he said. "We have to show people we're serious in order to make them obey the law."

'Mermaid' baby passes away

HE Burmese infant born in Phuket with 'mermaid syndrome' has died of kidney failure after a month-long struggle for survival, doctors have confirmed.

The infant, named Nichapa, was born at Vachira Phuket Hospital on July 9 after just 35 weeks of gestation.

She suffered from the rare congenital condition known as Sirenomelia, which is found in roughly one in every 100,000 births.

Vachira Phuket Assistant Director Sirichai Silapa-archa said Nichapa finally succumbed to kidney failure, passing away at 4.38am last Sunday morning after 29 days of life.

Nichapa survived much longer than most infants born with the condition, which is usually fatal after just a few days due to abnormal bladder and renal development.

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Supercheap roof comes off

MOPPERS at discount retailer Supercheap got a scare on Saturday when three sections of roof blew off and fell onto the merchandise below, causing considerable damage and public panic.

Fortunately, there were no deaths or injuries.

Additional damage was caused by rain that fell though the open sections onto merchandise before it could be moved to safety.

It is not the first accident that has happened at Supercheap.

A few years ago one of its warehouses was gutted by fire.

Back in 2002, a local Thai-language newspaper carried a report that a female shopper there was killed after being bitten by a king cobra hiding at the bottom of an onion display.

The store's management vehemently denied the report, dismissing it as 'poisonous nonsense' and part of a smear campaign initiated by a rival retailer.



Foreign workers rounded up Police ordered

ORTY-two foreign workers were arrested during an Immigration police raid on vendor stalls in Karon last Wednesday night.

Phuket Immigration Police Superintendent Col Chanatpol Yongbunjerd said the arrests were part of a crackdown on alien workers violating the terms of their work visas by engaging in work restricted to Thai nationals.

Col Chanatpol said 32 of those arrested – 23 men and 9 women – were working in retail sales; not sewing, as was specified on their work permits.

Retail sales is a profession restricted to Thai nationals under the law, he said.

"The illegal aliens will be prosecuted, repatriated to their home countries and blacklisted so that they can never enter Thailand again," he said.

Those that had the right documents would be allowed to stay, he added.

The crackdown follows a campaign which aimed to ensure all alien workers were legally registered with the authorities.

"Now that the alien worker registration campaign has ended, we're strictly checking all alien workers on the island, especially at entry points like piers and the Tah Chat Chai road checkpoint," Col Chanatpol said.

Under the 'work visa' program, Thais may employ

qualified nationals from Burma, Laos and Cambodia to work in six different categories of lowwage labor, including fishing and rubber tapping.

Arrested at vending stalls in Karon in a sweep that began at 7pm, the aliens were taken to Phuket Immigration headquarters at Saphan Hin for further examination and processing.

"All of those arrested claimed to be Burmese, but we have to check to see if that is true or not. A document check revealed that some were actually Nepalese," Col Chanatpol said.

The Immigration crackdown would now continue in other parts of Phuket, he said.

"I can not say what area we will target next, but officers have

to arrest them without resorting to violence," he added.

However, a crowd of some 30 employers and relatives who gathered in front of the detention area at Phuket Immigration complained that police had used violence in taking the suspects in.

"Some of them got kicked and punched. Even though we presented police with all the right documents to prove that they were legal, they still went ahead and arrested them," one employer told the Gazette.

Some employers showed the media work passes issued by the Burmese regime together with passports and other documents in an effort to show that those arrested were working legally.

to end jet-ski rip off trend

THE island's top policeofficer has ordered a fresh crackdown on jetski operators who scam tourists after Deputy Prime Minister Suthep Thaugsuban told him the rip offs must end.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong made a frank admission during a press conference last week that some of his own officers were knowingly allowing jet-ski operators to get away with massively overcharging tourists for repairs to the vehicles.

This must stop, he said.

Maj Gen Pekad said he had received a constant stream of complaints about the infamous Phuket jet-ski scam.

"When tourists damage the jet-skis, some operators are asking them for 50-60,000 baht for the repairs," he said.

"The real cost is often just a couple of thousand baht, but the operators threaten the tourists if they don't pay up."

Maj Gen Pekad said Mr Suthep had told both himself and Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop that they had to end the practice.

There were around 200 jetskis on the island, with 167 of them licensed, he said.

Maj Gen Pekad said he had set three new policies to end the problem.

First, police would prosecute any jet-ski operators who threatened tourists.

Second, police officers would not ignore or collude in the scam.

Third, six unbiased 'trusted' people in the community would be appointed to adjudicate in arguments between jet-ski operators and tourists.

These independent adjudicators would determine the real cost of any repairs to jet-skis when arguments broke out.

"Their decisions will have to be accepted by the tourists and the jet-ski operators, otherwise, they can see each other in court," Maj Gen Pekad said.

Police report rise in prostitution arrests

OLICE reported a dramatic rise in the arrests were 5,438 ya bah (methamphetamine) pills, number of arrests for prostitution in Phuket during August 2009, with 164 arrests representing a 70.8% increase over the same month last year.

Statistics for August released by the Phuket Provincial Police show that drug-related offenses were the most common crimes, with 208 people arrested in 179 cases.

The figure is a 50.4% increase year-on-year. Coming in a close second was gambling, with 205 arrests in 76 cases, an increase of 35.7%.

There were also 32 arrests for involvement in the underground lottery, statistics for which are tabulated separately.

Among the contraband seized in the drug

12.8 grams of *ya ice* (crystal methamphetamine), one kilogram of marijuana and 31 kilograms of *krathom* leaves, a native plant used as a stimulant.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong said there had been an increase in the transport of 1-kilogram bars of dried marijuana onto the island.

Most of it is sourced from the north of Thailand and sold locally at prices ranging from 15,000 baht to 25,000 baht per kilogram, he said.

There were four pre-meditated murder cases last month, one more than August 2008, according to statistics.

Arrests were made in three cases.







Work fallout prompts Windmills to the hills pylon suicide scare

THAI man who scaled a one of his colleagues. power pylon in Koh Kaew earlier this week thre-atened to leap to his death before eventually being talked down.

Suchart 'Aod' Srimalanon. 23, a Thai Air Asia employee at Phuket International Airport, removed his shoes and climbed the 34-meter-high power pylon just after 8am on September 7.

He then placed a call to a friend and told him he was experiencing problems at work.

His friends arrived at the foot of the pylon, behind the Isuzu garage on Thepkrasatree Road, soon after.

Hot on their heels was a 30strong team of police, Kusoldham rescue volunteers, Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation workers, firemen and a large crowd of worried locals.

Phuket City Police Superintendent Wanchai Ekpornpit led efforts to talk Suchart down, but to no avail.

According to Suchart's friends, he was under a lot of stress with a 'situation' with

At 10.30, Suchart's boss and colleagues arrived on the scene to try and coax him down. Their efforts worked.

Just before 11am, locals cheered as Suchart left his perch and climbed down straight into the arms of police.

His friends and boss hugged Suchart as he was taken away

The large inflatable crash mat that had been placed at the foot of the tower wasn't needed.

Neither were his shoes, which were left at the foot of the pylon.

HE Phuket Provincial Energy Office plans to build windmills in the Nakkerd Hills near the Big Buddha statue, a seminar on alternative energy was told on September 3.

Phuket Energy Office chief Jirasuk Tummawetch made the announcement during the seminar, held at the Royal Paradise Hotel in Patong.

The seminar was organized by non-government organizations trying to reduce global warming and conserve energy through improved technology.

The Energy Office wants to increase renewable energy production on the island using such technologies as wind turbines and waste-to-energy production, Mr Jirasuk said.

This would also help reduce the waste disposal crisis Phuket is now facing, he said.

As part of its 'Phuket Green Energy Project', the Energy Office hopes to erect wind turbines in the Nakkerd Hills by 2012.

The nine turbines would be located in hilltop areas, two near the Mingmongkol Buddha image and seven more on Radar Hill, he revealed.

However, more studies need to be conducted to determine if the average sustained winds there justify the large initial investment that would be required, he said.

"We have already asked for a wind meter from the Ministry of Energy," he said

"It will probably arrive after October 1, when fiscal year 2010 begins, perhaps in November or December.

"After it arrives, the wind meter will record wind speed and direction for a full year, after which time the data will be thoroughly analyzed," he said.

The wind meter will be installed in the parking area of the Mingmongkol Buddha image, where it will apparently reach a towering height of 90 meters, making it about twice as high as the Big Buddha.

Rental robbers confess

OLICE last week arrested three confessed members of a car theft ring that preys on car rental businesses.

At a press conference at Tah Chat Chai Police Station on September 3, Tourist Police Commander Adit Knamjitsuksri and Tah Chat Chai Police Superintendent Sakchai Limcharoen identified the suspect as Sitthiporn Chotet-srong, 23 years; Pranapat Thanasintorn, 31, and Benchaporn Sukkrai, 23.

All are residents of Samut Prakan province.

The arrests followed complaints to police from car rental businesses that cars rented out to thieves posing as tourists were never returned.

The 'rented' vehicles were driven to Bangkok, where they were sold on the black market by unscrupulous used car dealers.

The rental companies only knew they have been fleeced when the contract period was up and the 'customer' had vanished without a trace, police said.

Presented as evidence in the case were two Phuketregistered Honda City cars and

all three suspects' fake IDs and driver's licenses.

Three other vehicles are still missing.

Tah Chat Chai Police Superintendent Sakchai Limcharoen said the suspects have been charged with assuming fake identities to commit fraud, producing counterfeit official documents and using the documents to cause injury to others.

They each face up to 10 years in prison, he said.

Bangkok Tourist Police on August 2 arrested Mr Sitthiporn with two stolen cars in the capital.

Tah Chat Chai Police arrested Mr Pranapat and Miss Benchaporn in Phuket a day later.

Police are still investigating to try and arrest the ringleader, identified only as 'Pia'.

There are seven or eight Bangkok-based gangs that steal rental cars to fill specific orders from black market buyers.

Tourist destinations like Phuket are the most common targets and the gangs are very well organized, police said.

Tale of mythical creature doesn't hold much water

puzzling over the veracity of a so-called 'water elephant', which was supposedly found in a stream across the border in Burma.

Two men are in possession of what they claim are photographs and X-rays of the beast, which apparently measures only around 7cm in length.

Water elephants are found mainly in Burma's Karen State, according to local beliefs, and are reputed to have magical powers and bring good luck to their owners.

A scientist who examined X-rays of the beast, however, warned members of the public not to be gullible.

The carcass of the supposed water elephant belongs to a Mr Chuyok (surname not known), a former wood trader in tambon Wale on the Burmese border.

The strange creature was brought to the attention of the press by a soldier serving in the area, Lt Phongsak Thepthian.

Lt Phongsak said Mr Chuyot told him he had bought the water elephant from a Karen man in Burma when he was over the border buying wood in 2001.

Curious to find out if the carcass was a genuine water

TAK: Villagers have been elephant, Mr Chuyot and Lt Phongsak reportedly took the creature to be X-rayed at the local hospital. The X-ray revealed what appeared to be a fully formed skeleton.

Lt Phongsak sent copies of the X-ray and photos of the water elephant to journalists to try and establish what it really was.

The journalists passed on the X-rays to Dr Chawalit Withayanon of the Nakhon Ratchasima Fossil Research Institute for examination.

Dr Chawalit dismissed any notions of the X-rays coming from a 'real' water elephant.

He said the X-ray appeared to be a composite of two animals.

The head and spine belong to a shrew, while the legs appear to be from a frog.

Dr Chawalit warned members of the public not to fall for tales of mystical creatures that crop up in the Thai press on a regular basis.

Despite the doctor's warning, with 'genuine' water elephants reportedly selling for upwards of three million baht, the hunt for more specimens will no doubt continue.

Cable thief | 'Widow scam' arrests made

> KHON KAEN: Police have arrested a woman for allegedly scamming hundreds of thousands of baht from victims across the Northeast.

Wannawanach Butrit legally changed her name 23 times over the past six years and had plastic surgery to change her appearance, police said.

Mrs Butrit, 36, was picked up in Bangkok by officers from the Crime Suppression Division last Friday.

She was then handed over to Khon Kaen Police to be charged.

Police allege that Mrs Wannawanach claimed to be the widow of a wealthy American.

She snared victims by claiming she had been left a 200million-baht inheritance, but it was in a safe deposit box at the Bank of Thailand, police said.

She allegedly promised victims a share of the money if they lent her the cash needed to bribe officials at the bank to release it.

Khon Kaen Police Deputy Superintendent Thanomsit Wonwijan said the accused worked with two others in the scam.

The group hunted for victims at Chinese shrines, police said.

Mrs Wannawanach is wanted in Khon Kaen, Mahasarakham, Roi Et and Ubon Rachathani.

Last year, she allegedly borrowed 320,000 baht from a victim in Khon Kaen, promising to pay him one million baht when the inheritance was released.

The victim claimed she disappeared with the money.

Another victim alleged that Mrs Wannawanach borrowed their 800,000 baht Honda saloon to go and pick up the money, but she never returned.


Mrs Wannawanach denied all charges of fraud.

She also denied having major surgery to change her appearance, claiming she had just had one nose job.

Mrs Wannawanach said she knew the people who had accused her and would clear the situation up with them personally.

The road is beside The Point

he eternal question: what's The Point? The Point is a fancy new condominium block, "strategically located in the heart of Phuket Island", to quote the marketing line.

This is code.

It means: "it's not next to the beach, nor is it surrounded by lovely little turn-of-the-19thcentury shophouses, but what it is next to, see, is a bloody great big road, the bypass road, and down that road you can hurtle at breakneck speed to anywhere you want in minutes. Think strategically, stupid."

Living on this most vital of Phuket arteries, you'd imagine the strategic thinkers who snapped up The Point's 78 state-of-the-art condo units had it made.

But something was missing – and that something was easily accessible food.

Sure, there was the Big-C food court, but that was 200 meters away, and over a footbridge balanced precariously over the highway.

"Do something," The Point's residents pleaded.

"No problem," said the management. "How about a chic new Franco-Italian eatery with a range of affordable classics and fine-dining options to boot?"

"Rather!" said the residents, and The Point Bistro was born.

The bistro opened three months ago and is manned by a team of restaurant professionals flown in from Bangkok – including Yingsak Thongantung, the charmingly attentive restaurant manager, and executive chef Itthipol Samran, who cut his teeth in a number of the big city's highend French restaurants.

The restaurant is thoroughly modern, but relaxed – and thus worthy of the 'bistro' name.

It's also very well sealed from the hot, dusty bypass road.

The standard menu is mostly devoted to humble Italian fare – pizzas and pastas at very reasonable prices (from around 100 to 150 baht).





The pan-seared tiger prawn was sensitively sweetened with a lobster bisque foam and the roasted Australian rack of lamb was tremendous.

Pizza toppings range from the typical (margarita, seafood, vegetarian) to the tropical (Thai green curry, pork and holy basil).

Other options include bruschetta (70 baht), nicoise salad (100 baht), French onion soup (90 baht), spaghetti with spicy Thai seafood sauce (120 baht) and spaghetti olio (90 baht).

But, walk-by trade on the bypass road being a little unlikely (except perhaps from the odd hapless backpacker), the team have understood the need to provide something a little more special to make the bistro's name as a 'destination' restaurant.

Until the end of September, the restaurant is offering a 'Wine Matching' menu– three courses, with a wine to match each one – for 1,050 baht.

It's a menu designed to show what Itthipol and his team can do – and it's very well executed.

The seared Japanese scallops were mouth-meltingly tender and seductively flavored with a truffle-infused salt, while the marinated salmon was eminently succulent.

A fresh, bright Italian prosecco gave the course a well-deserved lift.

Meanwhile, the roasted Australian rack of lamb was tremendous.

A finely tuned rosemary sauce with soft dauphinois potatoes were superb companions to sweet and tender lamb cuts.

The pan-seared tiger prawn

- gargantuan, more of a dragon than a tiger – was sensitively sweetened with a lobster bisque foam.

Mains were matched with a chardonnay/viura blend from the Bodegas Nekeas winery in Spain, a structured white with a zippy acidity that worked well as a counterpoint to the sweet mains.

Desserts were a delight.

Soft bitter chocolate pudding and peach flambe in grande marnier were both accompanied by a luxurious home-made vanilla ice cream.


They were washed down with a smooth medium-bodied negroamaro from Italy's Cantina Due Palma winery.


Yingsak was at pains to point out that he wanted to select higher-end wines for the menu, but aimed to keep the price down.

He needn't have apologized, as all three were excellent.

With such a well-run, reasonably priced eatery on their doorstep, The Point's residents are enviably catered for.

The Point may be beside the bypass road – but the road is beside The Point.







Windows 7 the smart way

The first in a four-part series on Microsoft's new operating system

f you haven't yet decided whether to take the plunge and install Windows 7, permit me to give you a push. Most PC owners in Phuket need Windows 7. If the glitzy interface and better media handling doesn't grab you, the stability and security improvements should.

Windows XP has become a breeding ground for rootkits, viruses, and spyware. Millions of WinXP machines have been turned into zombies, and their owners don't know about it. Antivirus software has turned into a protection racket, and it slows down everything in both WinXP and Vista.

Windows 7 is at least a couple of orders of magnitude more difficult to infect than Windows XP, and it comes with a free, downloadable antivirus program called Microsoft Security Essentials.

You're going to want Windows 7 for a zillion reasons, and security is a big one.

Take it from a guy who's been writing about Windows and wrangling with Microsoft for the better part of two decades. Windows 7 represents an enormous improvement over anything that's come before.

Yes, some of you will thumb your noses at Windows 7. If you've trained your brain and your clicking finger to think like a Mac, I wish you well – Windows 7 won't wow you. If you waddle like a penguin and quote Linus Torvalds in your sleep, Linux still has its benefits. But if you're starting out new, or own a fairly recent PC, Windows 7 has much to offer.

To be sure, Windows 7 has substantial hardware requirements, but it isn't as iron-intensive as Vista. If you own a laptop that's more than three or four years old, it doesn't have enough oomph to do Windows 7 properly.

If you have a desktop PC that's more than five or six years old, Windows7 will push it beyond its limits. Best to consign really old PCs to the bit bucket.

But if you have a relatively recent laptop, or a not-yet-dead desktop, a few thousand baht should turn it into a road-worthy Windows 7 machine. The vast majority of PC owners on the island should be looking at upgrading as soon as they can.

Sadly, Windows 7 doesn't work with some older pieces of hardware, and a few older programs won't work, either. If you have an old scanner, web camera, or an orphaned software program, you may not be able to use it with Windows 7.

In my experience, anything that works with Vista will work with Windows 7.

Fortunately, there's a relatively simple way to figure out if you're going to have problems with your current hardware and software.


Microsoft's Windows 7 Upgrade Advisor scans your Windows XP or Vista machine and warns you about bumps on the road to enlightenment. Download it at microsoft.com/ windows/windows-7/upgradeadvisor.aspx and run it to see where the bodies are buried.

If Windows 7 can run everything on your current Windows XP or Vista machine, you should end up with a report similar to the one shown on this page.

I won't swear the Upgrade Advisor picks up all problematic pieces of hardware and software, but it's pretty darn close.

If your PC passes muster with the Upgrade Advisor, your next step is to make sure it has enough oomph to handle the load. A few thousand baht, tops, will turn most desktop PCs into roadworthy Windows 7 machines. Laptop owners have fewer options, but they're still crucial.

Windows 7 places few

demands on your PC, but you have to give it enough memory, and the video card or chipset has to keep up. Windows 7 needs at least 1GB of memory. Unless you edit movies or continuously re-calculate spreadsheets on the national debt, 2GB of memory will give you some breathing room and anything over 3GB is overkill.

To see how much memory you have on your PC, click Start, right click Computer or My Computer, and choose Properties. If you don't yet have 2GB, you should think about upgrading.

The easiest way to upgrade memory is to haul your computer to your favorite PC shop and say, "fill 'er up".

The whole process should take less than half an hour and cost 1,000 baht or so, depending on how much

memory you already have.

Microsoft has fancy specs for video cards, but there's an easy way to make sure you have enough power in the graphic department.

Take your computer down to your favorite shop and tell them you want the fastest video card that costs less than 1,500 baht.

Get a card installed that

costs less than 1,500 baht and you'll end up with video that's more than up to the task.

(Note that, with very rare

exceptions, you can't upgrade the video card in a laptop or netbook.)

The real hardware require-

ments for Windows 7 are so minimal you'll be amazed and pleasantly surprised by how fast it runs on an older PC with 1GB of main memory and a fast video card.

In my next column, I'll explain how to buy a real, completely legal copy of Windows 7 for about 1,700 baht. Yes, I know that real copies of Windows XP sell for more than 5,000 baht in Phuket right now. I also know that Windows 7 won't be officially available until October 22. But if you know the tricks, you can get the real Windows 7, right now, for about 1,700 baht.





















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When fashion bites back

nlike western teenagers, who fear becoming victims of ridicule when forced to have braces fitted on their teeth, many Thai teenagers put the metal implants on their must-have list and see them as fashionable status symbols to be flashed with a smile at every opportunity.

Specialist dentists, or orthodontists, are the only people properly qualified to fit braces, but as demand for braces has increased, so has the number of places that will fit them, many operated by unqualified 'dentists'.

The trend has grown to the point that fake braces designed as fashion accessories are now available at market stalls.

Last month, 17-year-old high-school student Juthamas Chaiyason from Khon Kean became a victim of the fashion after she had braces fitted by an unauthorized practitioner.

Juthamas died a few days after having the braces fitted, apparently from thyroid poisoning and cardiac arrest as a result of her body's reaction to the the metals used to make the braces.

In her final days, Juthamas suffered severe pain where her braces had been fitted and had trouble breathing to the point of passing out.

Following Juthamas' death, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has launched a clamp down on the availability of fashionable dental products.

The Dental Council of Thailand has also called upon the FDA to ban the sale of dental supplies to anyone other than licensed dentists.

In response, the FDA has announced that it would ask the Medical Supply Committee to list fashionable tooth braces as a medical item so they become controlled products.

There are reportedly about 57,000 websites offering trendy orthodontic services and one-day courses in orthodontic techniques in Thailand.

These websites will come under scrutiny from the FDA.

In Phuket, the brightly colored fashion braces can be found all over the island at various market stalls and fashion accessory shops, and can cost as little as 10 baht a set.

The braces, some of which come with images of flowers and love hearts, serve purely for beautification purposes and those found in shops and markets do not afford the wearer any medical benefits.

Since the widely publicized death of young Juthamas, beauty salons in the Ocean Shopping Plaza have ceased fitting the fashion braces.

One female proprietor whose shop offered this service said she had been ordered not to fit any more braces.

"We have been told by Phuket Public Health Department that we can no longer fit braces."

A stall trader at the weekend night market in Phuket Town said that widespread knowledge of Juthamas' death had slashed sales of his fake braces in half.

"These braces are very cheap, just 10 baht. You can wear them for four to five hours and then throw them away," he said.

However, the market trader, who is not qualified in any orthodontic or dental capacity, said he had "no idea" what material the fake braces, were made from.

Dr Rungsima Leelaprute, a pedeatric dental specialist from Bangkok Hospital Phuket, said children considering any kind of dental procedure should always consult a qualified orthodontist.

"It's unsafe not to, and a patient's safety is the foremost priority for qualified dentists and orthodontists," she said. "Untrained sellers of the fake braces use wire and material that should not come into contact with the mouth.," she said.


"A slight cut in the mouth could cause blood to become infected," she added.

Dr Rungsima said that the appropriate age to have braces fitted was usually between 12 and 14 years old or when the adult teeth are fully developed.

Another Phuket-based professional dentist, Dr Authen Hatsadee of Smile Island Dental, said that unqualified clinics fitting the fake braces fittings has been a long-running problem.

Orathai 'Tai' Chunual, a receptionist at Rang Hill Dental Clinic in Phuket Town, had colorful braces fitted professionally over a year ago.

"It is a popular trend among young people in Phuket to get colorful braces, but if you really want them, it's well worth getting the professional ones fitted," she said.

Another fashionable feature of the festivities was a 'Save Phuket' slogan to encourage conservation and environmental protection.



Khun Narong Hongyok was equally proud of his wife's achievements.

"I always support my wife in everything she does. We work together like champion tennis players. She works hard for charity, and does so selflessly.

"Now we have both received the 'Mom' and 'Dad' of the year award and I would like to thank the people of Phuket and our King and Queen. This is a great honor for our family.'

Tara believes Phuket will remain attractive for investors due to improved infrastructure, better security, and land office regulations that are more transparent.







Unraveling this lonely cosmos



any years ago, a youthful Bill Bryson announced his entry into the world of publishing with the lines, "I come from Des Moines. Somebody had to."

That's him in a nutshell: mordantly funny, self-deprecating and compellingly readable.

Now, an established reputation later, he has forsaken the safe haven of the personal reminiscence and taken off in a dangerous new direction with A Short History of Nearly Everything, (2004, Random House).

This impetus, fueled by his schoolboy curiosity about the universe and our place in it, was

an interest previously scuppered 10,000 light years away. by boring writers who "wanted to keep the good stuff secret by making it soberly unfathomable".

So Bryson decided to "seek the answers to all those questions no one had explained to me". In the process, Anglophile Bryson went from being one of the world's best-loved travel writers to becoming a successful popularizer, compiling a 'rough guide' to everything from biology to astro-physics.

Bryson himself is enthused too; rightly awestruck by the impossible odds that even allow us 'to be here at all' – an example of the 'Goldilocks Effect' where everything must be just right.

For this reason, he doesn't speculate much about the existence of life beyond our lonely planet, though the sheer unimaginable immensity of the cosmos surely makes this highly probable.

The opening sections are replete with mind-boggling facts. If the Earth is a pea, then Jupiter is 300 yards down the road. But on the same scale, Proxima Centauri, our nearest star, is

It gets wilder. Our Milky Way contains perhaps 400 billion stars and is only one of maybe 140 billion other galaxies.

Even one human being has "enough potential energy to explode with the force of 30 very large hydrogen bombs, assuming you knew how to liberate it".

But what makes the account so readable is the human interest. "What a piece of work is man," announced Hamlet. Bryson would concur, more or less wholeheartedly. He gives full value to the collossi of science – Newton, Darwin and Einstein, but Bryson is especially good at ferreting out fascinating biographical details.

Thus, the Reverend Bob Evans, armed only with his domestic telescope, has become the world's leading discoverer of supernovae simply because he has an uncanny ability to detect a single change in the teeming night sky.

Then there's Isaac Newton, who pierced his eyeball to the retina to see what would happen - fortunately nothing -. and

Cavendish, the first to combine hydrogen and oxygen to form water, but who was given to "subject[ing] himself to graduated jolts of electric current".

For these pioneers were all iconoclasts - literally image breakers – who tackled questions of enormous complexity, often with nothing more than their mathematical genius or their visionary

imaginations to assist them.

How did the universe start? How did life on earth begin? What is the age of our planet?

Closer to home, when did homo sapiens first appear? Why don't the seas get more saline, or more silted up? Why did the human brain get larger?

Many of these questions were answered by scientists so unassuming they never even bothered to announce their findings.

But Bryson is not entirely sanguine about mankind. In his final chapter, entitled 'Goodbye', he poses a puzzled question:

"If we are the highest form of life – maybe anywhere – why do we possess this impulse to exterminate our fellow creatures?" The dodo, the sea cow, Bachman's warbler, the Tasmanian tiger – the list is endless...

He concludes:

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Turbines not the answer

While well intentioned, the plan to erect enormous wind turbines in the Karon hillsides would probably come at too steep a cost to Phuket's environment and landscape to justify the amount of power they would generate, as official studies have already shown.

There is global consensus that development of renewable power resources is an important goal to ensure sustainable, environmentally friendly supplies for future generations. It is also widely agreed that wind farms will play an increasingly important role in that effort.

Some countries are experiencing rapid growth and technological advancement in harnessing the power of wind. Leading the charge are countries like Denmark, where wind farms now account for nearly 20 percent of power production.

In the USA, which now produces more megawatts of windpower annually than any other country, production almost tripled over the four-year period from 2005 to 2008.

Last month the Thai government announced that private firms have applied to set up wind farms in a number of provinces, with a combined expected production capacity of 1,600 megawatts.

The proposed wind farm in Phuket is just one of several that the Energy Ministry is considering around the country in a bid to increase electricity production in Thailand to 800MW annually by 2012.

While these are fine goals, the *Gazette* feels that the Nakkerd Hills are a poor choice of site for the project.

As anyone who has visited the Big Buddha image knows, the elevation does seem to enjoy the type of sustained winds needed to make putting turbines there plausible - though this has yet to be scientifically confirmed.

However, the prospect of having turbines tower above Phuket's largest religious icon and mar the view of the surrounding hillsides would create such an implausible eyesore that it is surprising that the Mingmongkol Faith 45 foundation is in favor of it, as the Energy Office claims.

It will also be interesting to see what the Royal Forest Department thinks of the plan, which would inevitably endanger the few remaining strands of virgin forest in the south of the island and lead to further encroachment.

From an economic standpoint, the conclusions of an independent review article on the prospects of wind power in Thailand commissioned by the Natural Research Council of Thailand and published last year are telling: "wind power is unlikely to be economically competitive where grid-connected electricity is available... in the foreseeable future."

Let's keep what remains of the beauty of the Nakkerd Hills intact for the future of the island's tourism industry.


I then spent the next four or five days liaising with the police, jet-ski owners, motorbike rental shops and bar owners, trying to prevent my troops getting the short end of the stick.

Looking to the future



FIRST PERSON

Last month, the Gazette broke the story on the disappearance or destruction of around 90 percent of the Coral Reef Squadron. Sunk less than a year ago in Bang Tao Bay, the project was hailed a huge success and served as a

lifeline for the area's dwindling coral reefs and underwater ecosystems. But following the disappearance of the Coral Reef Squadron, many people were quick to write the project off as a total disaster. In the wake of this criticism, Rainer Gottwald, CEO of the Thailand Diving Association's (TDA) Technical Committee, spoke to the Gazette's Daniel Ogunshakin about why the project wasn't a total failure and what the TDA would do differently next time.

egardless of what has subsequently happened, the Coral Reef Squadron was a worthwhile project which generated a wealth of positive media attention for Phuket.

After the sinking, we had some Hollywood film makers visit the Coral Reef Squadron and shoot underwater footage of the planes.

They told us the scenes would be used for special effects purposes in future motion

From a PR point of view this kind of publicity was priceless for Phuket and Thailand.

The Coral Reef Squadron also appeared on the pages of hundreds of magazines worldwide and as a result, Phuket and Thailand's reputation benefited from the hype.

It was also a sign to the Kingdom that the TDA was active and was keen to promote environmental conservation and protection, and that we were demonstrating our duty to

preserve some of this world's natural beauty for future

Originally, our dream was to sink a ship in Bang Tao Bay, but because this wasn't possible, we still had to do something to show the dive industry we were serious about marine conservation - and so the Coral Reef Squadron idea was born.

And it was a success. Thousands of divers dived the site and the wrecks are allowing life to flourish and attracting fish, even though some are broken.

Corals are still forming on the wrecks and a lot of fish are still using the structures for shelter against the currents.

Of course, we were disappointed with how things panned out, but we weren't helped by local fishermen who fished illegally above the site, dropping their anchors and nets onto the wrecks below.

I went down with an engineer and he showed me where an anchor had crashed into one of the planes.

When the shell of the plane is damaged, the currents will make short work of the remainder of the wreck.

We also went out to remove the nets time and time again and even tried to catch the fishermen on site, but they were too fast for us.

For future projects, we might have to have more security at the site or perhaps provide the fishermen with their own fish attracting devices.

As for the current state of the Coral Reef Squadron, I believe when the weather is better, we might find more of the site remains than perhaps we first thought.

Because of the weather and currents, we were unable to examine some of the deeper parts of the site and it's quite possible a lot of the wrecks have been covered by sand.

When we did the initial survey to determine where we should sink the planes, we conducted it behind Koh Waew, which is more protected from the current, but we were told we were unable to sink them there as it would encroach on the national park.

The final decision to place the planes where they are now wasn't made by the TDA, but of course we were obliged to help sink the planes to the bottom because we were aware of the amount of money that had been spent and of the impact it could have on protecting the underwater environment providing relief for existing dive sites was our main agenda.

Protecting coral reefs and marine life is of the utmost importance for the TDA and for the diving industry.

We don't want to get to the stage where we can only allow five people to dive a certain reef per day.

It would damage the local economy if we were forced to tell people they must stay at home instead of diving because reefs in the area couldn't support any more divers.

This would cause a lot of people in the dive tourism industry

Where we can pull together, is to promote the use of artificial reefs and fish attracting devices.

It's our belief that every major beach in Phuket must have fish attracting devices.

We didn't have the opportunity to take control of the project last time because there were too many other organizations involved. It became a case of too many cooks spoiling the broth.

Next time, we would like to use our own specialists who have expertise and experience gained worldwide.

We would also like to take responsibility for the whole project, rather than having people responsible for telling us what to do.

For the time being, we at the TDA are focusing our energies on promoting our Marine Scout project in schools.

The project is recognized by UNESCO, the World Underwater Association as well as numerous other organizations around the world and they have adopted the Marine Scout project as their own vehicle for educating

We have published 50,000 books entitled Coral Reefs and Mangroves: All we Need to Know for children, and we're taking the books to local schools to teach kids about the environment and the CMAS 10 golden rules for coral reef preservation.

Young people are the best people to teach about the importance of protecting the underwater environment and marine conservation.

It's harder to get an old buffalo like me to change the way they do things, but young people are easy to teach.

It's easy to make them aware of the beauty that exists them and consequences they face if they fail to look after it.

The Marine Scout project will produce results in the future, but for the time being we need to ensure the reefs still exist when the Marine Scout project bears fruit.

Fish attracting devices will take the pressure off existing dive sites and should help to preserve them for generations to come.

Also, next year will see the launch of the internationally recognized TDA/CMAS 'Scientific Diver' program and certification, which will teach divers about the marine environment and conservation.

We at the TDA hope this will push people to make more of an effort to preserve the underwater habitat.

The diving community needs to pull together as one to ensure our industry can survive.

Even if we aren't working directly together on the same projects, if everyone is making the effort to try and make a difference to protect our livelihood it can only be a good thing.

I have enough money for the course and visa payments, as well as enough money to get settled in for the first six months. After that, I will need to be able to support myself.

Are there any rules that prevent students from gaining employment in Thailand while studying?

Pol Capt Rassarin Teerapattanakul, Sub-Inspector, Phuket **Immigration, replies:**

No, you can not work in Thailand under a student visa because student visas are not one of the visa categories under which a work permit can be issued.

To work in Thailand you will need a non-immigrant visa of a category that allows a work permit to be issued.

The majority of foreigners working in Thailand have work permits issued under non-immigrant 'B' visas.

It isn't possible to hold both visas concurrently.

Investing in planet Earth

ver the years writing this column, I have from time to time mentioned investments in detail. In all cases they have been managed by registered financial institutions and have been simple for readers to research further. The risks have been obvious.

This week's example is completely different. This is by intention. I do not endorse the following investment; I simply do not know if it is good, bad or indifferent.

The company Touchwood, and its area of operations is managed forestry. Touchwood Asia's head office is in Bangkok, and its forestry areas cover Thailand, Sri Lanka and Australia.

In Thailand, Touchwood is a Board of Investment (BOI) approved company. It manages two different types of plantations.

The first is bamboo, which is, in fact, classified as a tree. The particular type of bamboo Touchwood works with is known as Dendrocalamus Asper.

Bamboo has a wide range of uses, including furniture, constru-ction, flooring, fibers, as well as in the charcoal, energy refining industries. Byproducts include edible shoots and cattle fodder. It is also the fastest growing plant on the

Touchwood's bamboo investments are over a 13-year term. The company claims that from year three onwards investors will have a return varying from 15 percent to 18 percent per annum. It all depends on the amount you invest. For 20 bamboo trees the investment is US\$5,515, which in turn gives a projected harvest value of US\$17,058.

The largest investment is 450 trees, which costs US\$102,650, with a projected harvest value of US\$383,810, although these figures are not guaranteed.

Once the 13-year term has expired the investor will receive no further returns. If the investment returns 15-18 percent from years four to 13 as claimed,

this would be similar to a very high yielding term certain annuity. During the term of the investment, ownership is fully transferable. This is not likely to be an easy process unless done in the early stages and returns have matched sales brochure

Touchwood's second possible investment is in agarwood (crassna). Its source is the aquilaria tree, which is found in Southeast Asia. It is apparently listed by the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) as falling into this category. If it is grown on a plantation it can be traded. It is claimed to be the most expensive resinous wood in the world.

Known by a number of different names, including gaharu, eaglewood, aloeswood, jinko and chen xiang, agarwood is highly aromatic and used in perfume, aromatherapy and incense.

Touchwood says it has virtually endless demand for this product in the Gulf States, where it is used for perfume. It does not require the addition of alcohol in perfume manufacture, which means it adheres to Islamic

Touchwood treats Agarwood as a seven-year investment and, depending on the number of trees, claims annual returns of between 14.5 and 23

Investors' capital is

returned after the seven-year period.

Although the investments are in Thailand, investments should be made in US dollars. Touchwood states that while investment is possible in Thai baht, it would be taxable. None of the returns are guaranteed.

This is a completely different type of investment caveat emptor. Please direct enquiries to Touchwood. The company's website is available at www.touchwood.com.

Another type of investment is the New Earth Solutions Recycling Facilities Investment Sub-fund, an investment option offered by the Premier Group.

This is a normal unit trust/ mutual fund-type investment. The fund is registered in the Isle of Man and is classified as an experienced investor fund that is supervised by the Isle of Man authorities. It is available to the public but any application must reflect the experience of the investor to be able to qualify for this category of fund.

Most investments, in reality, will be via insurance companies, with the institution being the 'experienced investor'. This is all to the benefit of investors because before any fund is accepted by insurance companies it has to run the stringent gauntlet of their investment committees.

New Earth is one of the new 'green' funds. However, it does not concern itself with the glamorous end of that market. Rather, it deals in waste management and has, through New Earth Solutions, contracts with various city and county councils in the UK such as Bristol City Council, Bournemouth City Council and Leicestershire County Council.

New Earth Solutions receives a fee per tonne of waste it processes, as well as income from the sale of recycled materials. It already has three operational waste treatment facilities, with more to open in 2010 and 2011.

Another group operation is New Earth Energy, which closes the 'loop' between waste treatment and energy recovery.

The underlying holdings of the fund are valued by property specialists GVA Grimley, who have 180 years of experience in property valuations.

The fund auditors are one of the 'big four': Ernst & Young. Custodian bank is BNP Paribas through its Isle of Man branch. BNP Paribas is France's largest

Premier Group is an established fund management group. I have known its chairman Mike Richardson for over 17 years; since he was managing director of Clerical Medical International, now part of Lloyds Banking

The fund, although very new, has performed well. Returns are: three months +2.66 percent; six months +6.56 percent; one year +12.10 percent, net of annual management fees.

or most, 2009 has been a year they wish would just end, and New Year's Day is becoming more anticipated than its more well-heeled relation, Christmas.

Over the past two years, the broad Phuket property market, Thaksin Shinawatra's political demise, a once-in-a lifetime global recession and the high profile political events within the Kingdom have made Thailand headline news on breaking stories across the globe.

While the broader resortgrade real estate market has hit mid-market products hard because of its reliance on overseas buyers who have been temporarily sidelined because of financial constraints, there has been much speculative talk on the state of upscale property.

Hospitality consulting firm C9 Hotelworks has done some market research on the state of play for the first half of 2009 and compiled the Luxury Villa Market Update. The new results may surprise many naysayers.

Between January and June, luxury villa sales totaled 3.5 billion baht, comprising 19 properties sold at 65 million baht and above.

A resale market has developed with existing villas producing a total of one billion baht in sales from a total luxury market value of 10 billion baht with 92 units for sale.

Comparing geographical demand, 'Millionaires' Mile' in Kamala and Nai Thon and Bang

Tao with their respective Malaiwana and Istana developments led the pack.

During last year's market overview, the east coast registered developments ranked highly, but the three highest profile projects – Cape Yamu, Jumeirah and Sri Panwa – have moved the majority of their inventories into this year, providing buyers with comparable units to those on the west coast shoreline.

Phang Nga and northern Phuket attained the highest price per square meter – in excess of 200,000 baht – as the desirable beachfront locations could demand premium prices.

Mixed-use or hotelmanaged properties, as opposed to straight residential offerings, are emerging as the preferred investment vehicle in today's challenging conditions. Sales absorption rates for these properties have registered considerably higher and attained higher pricing based on pricing per square meter by 55 percent.

Projects offering guaranteed yields traded faster than those with optional rental programs.

HOUSE PRICES: Mixed-use or hotel-managed properties as opposed to straight residential offerings are emerging as the preferred investment vehicle in today's challenging conditions.

Interestingly, a number of hotels have been able to convert repeat guests into property buyers on the basis of familiarity and loyalty fostered over the years.

For developers, the first half of 2009 brought some stability to fluctuating commodity costs with many returning to what they were in the first six months of 2008. This shift has primarily come on the back of a reduction in the cost of steel.

There is now less risk to margins than at any other time during the past 12 to 18 months and longer-term volatility appears to be flattening out.

That said, the fact that labor costs have continued to rise along with inflation has many major quantity surveyors believing that costs will remain at the current level for the rest of the year.

Viewing the prospects of recovery remain dependent not only on Thailand's political and economic issues, but the wider global picture.

With continued flat market conditions expected to continue into 2010, anticipated recovery has been pushed back to 2011.

It's important to note that excellent long-term fundamentals are at play for Phuket: its improving international airlift and number of direct flights, high brand concentration and critical mass of brands.

Investment by the government is being pushed into a new international airport terminal and improvement of the islands road network, while further development of demand generators — marinas, golf courses and the service sector — have continued to grow which all bode well for luxury property.

At the same time, however, the luxury segment is hitting barriers to entry due to limited prime seafront land. This will push new areas of development into Phang Nga and the bay. As a result of the current recession, property launches have been constrained, which has allowed excess product from the supply stream to be absorbed.

Property is by nature a cyclical business, and once normal trading patterns return, there is the potential to capture a good share of the upswing.

Phuket has continued to evolve from a sector mainly promoted by smaller independent developers into something more in line with traditional norms and standards.

Areas to watch for growth are resales, rentals and high-end fractionals. Given the connection now between hotel chains or managed products and shared ownership, I believe by next year we are going to see this segment becoming a significant niche market

While the broader market needs to move away from its reliance on foreign purchasers and increase domestic sales, the luxury market looks set to keep on the same successful course for the time being.





Pocket-sized Internet access, 'anywhere'

ou can now access the Internet anywhere in Phuket, even if you're stuck in a remote house in the hills, speeding along in a car or out in a boat in the Andaman.

"...Then we plugged the same card to a MobieWave wireless router and ran the same [Internet speed] test on the same computer, using a wireless connection. That test also came in at 1,200 Kbps. The folks at Phuket IT Solutions say the MobieWave includes signal boosting capabilities, to make the CAT AirCard run faster in locations with poor CDMA reception - including, they say, Boat Lagoon. We couldn't test that last Sunday but, if true, it's a bit of icing on the cake."

The MobieWave range is not Phuket IT Solutions' only product. The company provides a range of IT and Internet services, including website design and hosting, Internet marketing and SEO, hospitality software and webcam security systems - a one-stop-shop for Internet and technology needs.

"After having spent time on the island working on specialized projects, I came to realize so many services were in need of up-grading.

Power up with the right tools

ne of this column's purposes, in addition to offering some homerepair tips and build-it-yourself projects, is to help advise readers about tools, homerepair items and/or materials which may not be as good as we could wish.

Several frequently used home workshop items that fit this category are jig-saws, drills and drill bits.

For financial reasons, we often have to purchase budget brands at Big C, Tesco-Lotus or Robinson's and make do, but there are some problems with certain budget brands.

First, the hand-held jigsaws. Almost every budget jigsaw sold here uses a small, gray, cast-metal blade retainer on the front of the shaft which holds the blade.

Even with different brands, this piece is as exactly identical. *Don't* buy any saw that has this type of piece.

This small piece, when, not if, but when it breaks, will totally disable your saw, because when that part breaks, there's no way



to hold the blade (photo 1, left). No replacements are available and you must buy another saw.

The best tip to help prolong this crucial piece's life – don't over torque!

This piece is very thin and brittle, since it's cast, not stamped or forged.

It's held in place by two small Allen head screws, which are made of far stronger metal. Insert your blade, align carefully and tighten, but do *not* overtighten. Once it cracks, that's it!

A small trick which may help. Before inserting a blade, wrap two complete turns of scotch-type tape around the part of the blade's shaft which is covered by this retainer. Any more and the blade won't fit in the retainer's slot.

Two wraps give a sort of 'cushioning effect' and allow the retainer to compress something other than itself.

If you do this, you may

have to go easy on the 'pushing' when using the saw, as the blade may slip if pushed too hard, but a light touch is better anyway. Let the blade do the work, not your arm.

I've recently seen some budget brands which have this piece made of a black-colored metal, that looks to be of better quality, and have bought one to check it out (photo 1, right).

It hasn't broken yet, but I'm waiting... and being careful.

Drills sold here are usually acceptable, but the cheap hammer drills have an annoying tendency for the hammer-mode activator switch to become loose, and slide enough into position to activate the hammer function when not needed.

Not much can be done, due to the switch's cross-wise design.

On projects that required a lot of drilling but no hammer, I've used a tie-wrap to hold a small 'button' of wood over it to keep it in place.

Advice: use a hammer drill for masonry work only, use a standard drill for everything else.

Another problem is the keys used to operate the chuck jaws – the chuck is the three-

jawed vise-like part that holds

the drill bits.

These 'keys' are made of cheaper metal than the chuck jaws and can wear down quickly (photo 2 shows, left, the original worn key, and, right, a newer, better one).

Remember when using them to turn them slowly and smoothly, applying downward as well as rotational torque, to keep their teeth in tight contact with the chuck's teeth. Otherwise the key's teeth will

slip and wear down.

Luckily, replacement keys are available and seem to be harder than the ones usually included with new drills. Buy one when you buy your drill – it's always a good idea to have two keys around, just in case one goes missing. Also, keep the chuck jaws lubricated.

Lastly, drill bits. Photo 3 shows, top to bottom, a wood bit, a masonry bit, a quality twist bit used for metal and a cheap twist bit.

Notice the cheap bit's dull-looking metal and its overly deep grooves, creating a visibly thinner cross section.

Cheap bits dull quickly, and being of poorly-tempered metal, will bend, instead of break, when overstressed or overheated.

This is dangerous because a bit that breaks will send your drill into the work-face rather suddenly, but the drill will still be moving away from you.

A drill bit that bends, however, can cause the drill to buck and twist in your hands and instantly bring your fingers into close contact with the business end which is still rapidly spinning a sharp piece of metal.

Avoid packs of ten for a few baht and buy only good, imported bits from Germany, Sweden or the USA.

They are much longerlasting and safer. Remember: you can always earn more money, but you can't grow new fingers.

That's it for now. Have a beer, but always be extra careful when using your power tools! See you next time!
