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## **Basket case** ruins holiday

### Bike bandit leaves Brits broke

WO tourists robbed in Kata were left penniless when a thief snatched a bag containing all their remaining holiday cash from the basket on their rented motorbike.

The thief, riding another motorbike, snatched the bag on Kata Noi Road at about 7.30pm

The bag belonging to British holidaymaker 21-year-old Emma Kim Parker, a passenger on the bike driven by a male traveling companion, contained the equivalent of about 230,000 baht in US dollars and euro.

An expensive Nikon camera was also in the bag.

Police believe the lone basket bandit took advantage of the fact that the tourists would not be able to give chase with two of them weighing down their bike.

The pair had planned to stay in Thailand for several weeks, but with no spending money left after

arriving less than a week ago, they told the Gazette they were so traumatized that they wanted to go home as soon as possible.

'This is our first time in Thailand and we don't know what to do now. We've never had this kind of experience and didn't expect our stuff could be stolen off a [moving] motorbike," they said.

While waiting for money to be sent from abroad so they could buy flights home, the young travelers had to rely on charity from the owner of the Pineapple Guesthouse where they were staying.

"There is a safe deposit box in their room, but they didn't keep their money in there. I don't know why," said the owner.

According to the police, the bandit had already targeted a young Swedish couple who were riding a motorcycle in the same area an hour earlier that evening, making off with a camera and 3,000 baht in cash.

## Controversial road 'good for environment'

NEW road linking Chalong and Patong will reduce accidents, save fuel and result in the destruction of fewer trees than detractors believe, the Phuket governor said many trees cut down." on November 9.

Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop was addressing a meeting at Provincial Hall to discuss progress on the controversial project, a key part of his aggressive plan to improve Phuket's road network

There are three possible routes which can be used to complete the road, all of which have

already been partially cleared, Gov Wichai told the meeting.

"They're all pathways," he said. "Whichever route we choose to develop, there won't be

Lower stretches of the road on the Chalong side pass through the entrance of Luang Pu Supha Temple, he said.

The 4.6-kilometer route would reduce the island's fuel consumption to the tune of an estimated one million baht per day, the governor added.

The new road would reduce accidents along Patak and Phra

Barami Roads, both of which are leted in about one month, with 'quite dangerous routes', according to Gov Wichai.

However, the project still needs Cabinet approval to go ahead.

Gov Wichai said Cabinet had asked that the project's environmental impact assessment be revised before it can get started.

The road is legally problematic because parts at the highest elevations need to pass through national forest land, much of which is above the 80-meter building limit put in place in 1994 to prevent erosion, encroachment and flooding.

The EIA should be comp-

Cabinet backing expected within about three, Gov Wichai said.

"Once the project gets a Cabinet resolution, I am sure the construction could be finished within nine months," he said.

Twenty-six million baht in funding for the project would come from the government's 100billion-baht Strong Thai Action Plan 2012 stimulus package.

Another 14 million would be provided by Patong Municipality and Chalong Tambon Administration Organization (TAO).

## **Encroachment road** divides local opinion

villagers and local officials are at odds over whether a new road in Mai Khao caused the destruction of 25 rai of peat swamp forest or stopped the encroachment from being much worse.

Mai Khao Tambon Administration Organization built the 28-million-baht road, which is 3.5 kilometers long and skirts the boundary of Jik Forest.

Mai Khao TAO President Sarawut Srisakhukham said the road was built for two reasons: "to serve the convenience of both tourists and local villagers, and to protect the forest from encroachment by investors."

Nevertheless, he admitted the forest had shrunk from 102 rai to 77 rai since the road was built but added the road served as a boundary, protecting what remained of the peat swamp forest.

"Private land and the forest are clearly separated by the road," he said. "If we didn't build it, I'm sure all the forest would be gone."

But villagers complained that the road had actually caused the destruction of a large portion of the forest because new developments have sprung up along it.

Responding to their concerns, Phuket MP Chalermlak Kebsup asked the Natural Resources and Environment Committee of the House of Representatives to launch an investigation into the project.

Committee President Waruj Siriwat visited the site and confirmed that encroachment had occurred.

"Villagers are afraid the road has damaged the forest and that it will bring more property construction into the area," he said.

"We have to check whether there was a public hearing and environmental impact assessment before the construction started," he added.

Mr Waruj noted that the peat swamp and mangrove forests in the northwest of Phuket had been nominated by Thailand as a Ramsar Convention site, meaning they were of international importance and should be protected.

The Ramsar Convention is an international treaty aimed at conserving the world's wetlands.

## Coral reef discovery

NEW coral reef covering an area almost the size of two soccer fields has been discovered north of Phuket off the coast of Phang Nga.

The reef was discovered by fishermen around five nautical miles west of Kho Kao Island in Phang Nga's Takuapa District. It lies at a depth of about 21 meters.

Mr Chaimongkol Yaemarunpattana, a coral researcher at the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC), was part of a diving team that surveyed the reef on November 9.

"The reef's fertility is

NEW coral reef average and we found mostly covering an area almost the size of two soccer fields has been average and we found mostly encrusting corals, tabulate corals, several species of fish and four or five octopi," he said.

Mr Chaimongkhol said the reef was very beautiful and 'very attractive for diving in general'.

The Phang Nga Tourist Association, together with the Marine and Coastal Resources Conservation Department, and the Department of Fisheries, has started a project at the new reef and others in the province called 'Nemo Return'.

The project will involve introducing new fish to the reefs and carrying out cleanups in order

to improve dive spots and reduce the number of divers around the popular Similan Islands.

## Phuket's PAD and UDD head North

PHUKET'S yellow-shirted People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) supporters and their red-shirted opponents, the United Front for Democracy Against Dictatorship (UDD), will both be traveling to large gatherings in the near future.

The Phuket PAD will be heading to Bangkok to protest former Thai Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra's appointment to a high-level advisory position by Cambodian premier Hun Sen.

The protest will take place at Sanam Luang on November 15.

Phuket PAD co-ordinator Aparat Chartchutikumjorn said the island's activists would definitely be attending the Bangkok protest.

"I've already had a lot of calls about this, so I think a lot of people are going to go," she said.

"Anyone in any color shirt who agrees with us can join the protest," she said.

Meanwhile, Phuket UDD leader Sunthorn Toemarn

applauded Mr Thaksin's new appointment by Phnom Penh.

"It's right and democratic," she said. "It's a good thing and we agree with it."

The UDD would be heading to Khao Yai National Park in Nakhon Ratchasima province for a big meeting – including a phone in from Mr Thaksin. The rally will be hosted by the Bonanza Khao Yai Hotel on Saturday, he said.

Around a hundred red-shirts would be heading to the gathering in cars and vans, he said.

## Cops fish for loan sharks

Police are cracking down on loan sharks who offer desperate people high interest loans, sometimes backed up with the threat of violence against those who fail to pay back their debts.

The most recent arrests were four men accused of offering loans with interest above the legally permissible rates.

They were paraded before a press conference at Phuket City Police Station early November.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong said police are also looking for another group of loan sharks who recently put a number of debtors in Vachira Phuket Hospital after they failed to meet their repayments.

Gen Pekad said the men were charging interest rates of 30 percent per month.

All four suspects confessed to charges of usury.

Back in June, Chalong Police arrested a gang of loan sharks extracting money from Rawai's sea gypsy community.

Police said at the time that they believed there were an estimated 40 loan shark gangs operating in Phuket.

## Arrest made in jewel heist

FTER analyzing DNA evidence, police ar rested a cashier at Phuket FantaSea early November, for the theft of more than two million baht's worth of diamond jewelry from the souvenir shop safe on May 23.

Police said a sample of a 26year-old female suspect's hair matched those found near the safe shortly after the robbery, which took place at Phuket FantaSea in Kamala.

Police said they found fingerprints on the safe and hair nearby.

Police collected hair samples from 940 people and used DNA analysis as part of the investigation, he said.

The suspect denied committing the robbery when police interrogated her after her arrest, police said.

Police are awaiting results of fingerprint tests for further evidence against the suspect.

## Rubble trouble What a great guy

47-year-old Muslim man with no education past high school has won top honors for Phuket in a nationwide search for the most outstanding citizen in each Thai province.

Jeerasak Torthip was named an 'Outstanding Citizen' for his work in securing a simple, sustainable way of life for the people of Bang Rong Village, a coastal community of about 1,000 Muslims in tambon Pa Khlok.

Mr Jeerasak was awarded the honor through a project called Thaen Khun Paen Din ('Showing Gratitude to the Country') 2552, run by The Nation Group together with the Social Development and Human Security Ministry.

He was credited for his devotion over the past decade to restoring and protecting the natural environment in Bang Rong, and ensuring the community sticks to a traditional, Islamic way of life.

Mr Jeerasak said he encourages his neighbors to resist materialism temptations, stressing the importance of mangrove forests to their way of life.

"Eighty per cent of village people use mangroves as a source of food. Besides that the mangroves played a role as a barrier to the 2004 tsunami."

Materialism destroyed this traditional lifestyle, he said.

"Villagers sold their land to property developers in exchange for money to buy cars and live lavishly," he said.

When the mangrove forests started being destroyed it became harder and harder for villagers to make a living, he said.

He uses his position as a leader at Bang Rong Mosque to instill the community with Islam-based beliefs about conserving nature.

In 2002, Mr Jeerasak and other mosque leaders created a project called 'Bang Rong Agrotourism'.

The project is based at Bang Rong pier, which is surrounded by

over 2,000 rai of mangrove forest.

Tourists can hire canoes and boats to explore the forests, take a bicycle tour of the village or go trekking.

"We use tourism activities as a tool to manage community resources both on land and in the sea, through a process of informal learning," he said.

"The villagers are offered an opportunity to remain in the community rather than seek work elsewhere. They also learn to value their own resources."

Around 50 tourists visit the Bang Rong mangroves every day.

"All the guides for tourism activities are people from the community. Everything runs in a cycle," he said.

Mr Jeerasak's community projects don't stop at agrotourism.

The mosque committee started a savings fund with 30 villagers back in 1997.

The fund now has more than 700 members with almost 30 million baht in savings, Mr Jeerasak said.

"With this fund we've bought back many plots of land from investors and given scholarships to poor but smart students so they can get a university education," he said.

Mr Jeersak talked of his feelings on receiving the 'Outstanding Citizen' honor.

"I never expected to receive it," he said.

"Everything I've done is for my neighbors, because of my love for the land and especially because of my love for His Majesty the King."

He would put his award on public view at Bang Rong Mosque, he said.

## Happy Hainan visitors

**EPRESENTATIVES** from the Chinese province of Hainan paid a visit to Phuket as part of a three-day study tour examining tourism management and development strategies.

The Hainanese delegation held talks with Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop, Vice Governor Smith Palawatwichai and other officials at Provincial Hall on November 9.

It was the final day of their three-day stay in Phuket, which included tours of the Laguna Phuket resort complex and the Phuket FantaSea cultural theme park.

Hainan, the smallest Chinese province, comprises some two hundred islands. The vast majority of residents stay on the main island of Hainan Dao.

The delegation included Hainan Vice Governor Jiang Sixian, Hainan Tourism Dev-elopment Commission Division Director Zhou Ping and Foreign Affairs Office Director Gen Wu Shicun.

Official visits between leaders of the two islands date back to 2002, when then-Hainan Governor Wang Xiaofeng led a delegation to meet then Phuket Governor Pongpayome Vasaputi,

who is now Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Interior.

Hainan has a rapidly expanding tourism industry, with the vast majority of visitors being mainland Chinese.

"The numbers are increasing annually. We already have two airports, but it is not enough to meet demand, so we are planning to build another," Mr Jiang said.

Noting that Hainan has 70 times the land area and 25 times the [official] population of Phuket, Mr Jiang said he wanted Phuket business people to be aware of the investment opportunities Hainan has to offer.

Gov Wichai told reporters

the Hainanese delegation 'learned a lot from us'.

Mr Jiang also invited Gov Wichai and a Phuket degleagtion to visit Hainan from March 20 to 22 next year for a tourism prmotional event.

The possibility of sending a Phuket delegation to attend the March event would be discussed with the TAT and Phuket Chamber of Commerce.

In addition to being island resort destinations, Phuket also has cultural ties with Hainan.

A considerable portion of Phuket's ethnic Chinese can trace their roots back to the island.

The Hainanese Shrine in Phuket City is one of the few Chinese shrines on the island that does not take part in the annual Vegetarian Festival.

Phuket Hainan Association President Chaovapong Mekarakul, also publisher of Siangtai Daily newspaper, told the Gazette Phuket and Hainan were officially linked as sister cities several years ago when then Phuket Governor Udomsak Uswarangkura signed a memorandum of understanding with his Hainanese counterpart at the time.

## New Swedish consul

DOCTOR Bangkok Hospital Phuket is the new go-to man in times of trouble for the Andaman region's sizable Swedish community.

Dr Sompoch Nipakanot, assistant director of Bangkok Hospital Phuket, was formally appointed as the new Swedish honorary consul on November 2.

Swedish ambassador to Thailand Lennard Linner presented a letter of appointment to Dr Sompoch from HM The King Carl Gustaf XVI.

The appointment ceremony was also attended by Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop, representatives from other foreign consulates in Phuket and members of the island's Swedish community.

The event took place in the hospital's King Karl Gustaf Conference Hall, which was built after more than 540 Swedes lost their lives in the 2004 Asian tsunami disaster.

Bangkok Hospital Phuket treated many of the survivors, earning praise from the Swedish government and leading the Swedish Royal Family to grant permission to name the conference room in honor of the Swedish monarch.

Dr Sompoch was a member of the hospital's executive board at the time.

"When the tsunami happened, lots of Swedes were looked after by the medical team here at the hospital," he said.

"The Swedish government was extremely grateful to us. The Swedish Red Cross even invited us to their country to lecture them on how we coped with Swedish patients at that time."

In February 2005, HM King Carl Gustaf XVI visited Thailand with HM Queen Silvia to visit areas affected by the tsunami.

Dr Sompoch was the royal couple's private physician for the duration of the visit.

On his appointment to the position of honorary consul, he said: "I am so proud...My next task is to bring benefits to both Thai people in Phuket and the Swedish community here."

Dr Sompoch said he was "just an ordinary physician like other medical staff," saying he had been appointed to the job purely because of his contribution during the tsunami.

The previous Swedish honorary consul was Wichit Na Ranong, a Thai tourism industry pioneer and owner of the Pearl Group of resorts.

After the tsunami, the Swedish government appointed one of its own nationals to take charge of consular affairs in Phuket.

In mid-2008, the official consular position ended and Mr Wichit was again offered the honorary post. After Mr Vichit declined, the position was offered to Mr Sompoch.

## Canine caper leaves carnal cleric in coma

PITSANULOKE: An errant used as a makeshift lubricant. monk was caught in a compromising position on November 5 after he suffered a stroke while having sex with a temple dog behind Sam Toei Temple in Wat Thong District.

Villagers were drawn to the scene by the howls of protest from the dog, which the monk had lashed to a tree.

After seeing the monk in flagrante delicto with the heavily pregnant Thai Bangkaew dog, villagers called the police.

By the time officers arrived on the scene, the excitement had obviously been too much for the 65-year-old monk to take.

He was found lying unconscious next to the animal. A bottle of dishwashing liquid was found next to the monk, presumably

Rescuers rushed the monk to hospital, where he remains in a coma. Doctors said he had suffered a stroke and are not sure if he will survive.

The cleric was identified in Thailand's best-selling daily newspaper as Phrapan Chitu-

Phramali Dhamachantho, the abbot of Wat Sam Toei, said Phrapan had been at the temple for only a few days.

Temple authorities were preparing to ask him to leave because he had refused to provide references from his former temple.

Police did not say what Phrapan would be charged with if he regains consciousness.

# Youths kill cop in karaoke bar fight

NAKHON SRI THAMMARAT: Three youths stabbed a police officer multiple times and carved a star into his forehead following an argument in a Chawang District karaoke bar last Thursday.

The officer, 41-year-old Sen Sgt Maj Somchai Chumjan, later died in hospital from his injuries.

Witnesses told police that Sen Sgt Maj Somchai was drinking with a friend in Khru Niow Karaoke when the attack happened.

Sen Sgt Maj Somchai, who had earlier been drinking in another bar with fellow police officers, became angry with three young men who were singing and dancing in front of the TV screen, blocked the subtitled song lyrics.

The officer threw some ice at the youths to get them to move. Later, when Sen Sgt Maj Somchai went to the toilet, the youths followed him.

They held him in a lock and stabbed him multiple times and,

in a scene reminiscent of Quentin Tarantino's latest film Inglourious Basterds, carved a star in his forehead.

Sen Sgt Maj Somchai managed to stagger back to his table. His friend rushed him to hospital, but doctors were unable to save him.

Inspector Chitranarong Nunak from Chawang Police said officers think they know the identities of the three youths and are now hunting for them.

South African Peter Teron, 49, and American Richard Herring, 54, both suffered head injuries in the attack by the enraged pachyderm.


The attack happened after elephant show where visitors are allowed to feed the animals.

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## Rising from the economic ashes

't's November already and there are few people in the hospitality business in Krabi with high hopes for this high season. Many businesses are hoping to survive by cutting costs, reducing prices or enticing customers with freebies and package deal discounts.

Some local businesses are being harder hit than others. The economic downturn has affected the world unevenly in terms of its depth and severity, and its recovery is also experiencing a variety of trajectories, depending on where you are located.

Market psychology is quite different if you are sitting in Amsterdam than if you are in Shanghai.

China, for one, has been less affected than its neighbors and mainland Chinese investors continue to pour money into Hong Kong, Macau and other countries in the region.

It is no secret that the powerful Thai Chinese community in the Kingdom is forging closer investment ties to the mainland during these harsh economic times

Other investors in Thailand have started to become a bit bolder as the purse strings of the banks and venture capitalists are slowly loosening. Some see this as the opportune time to make an investment; business is depressed and the economy is just starting to stabilize.

As a successful Wall Street investor friend of mine always said, "Buy fear, sell greed".

Pockets of investment money continue to exist. A recent investment meeting of businessmen from five diverse countries proved that, while investors are certainly more averse to risk taking, a well thought out and researched business plan can get financed.




Investors' confidence that Koh Lanta's property and hospitality market is bouncing back has spurned construction of several new resort projects. This one, Thai Island Dream Estate, is at Klong Nin beach.

Several real estate development projects in Krabi seem to be timed well to take advantage of the coming improvement in consumer confidence.

While questions remain about Thailand's political future (was there ever a time when this wasn't the case?), it still rates highly in most categories as a holiday and residential destination.

One of the most ambitious projects is the Thai Island Dream Estate development on Klong Nin beach on Koh Lanta. This project encompasses 43 rai and offers a total of 140 units, including beachfront villas for 24.7 million baht.

Compared to similar properties on Koh Samui and Phuket, this is a bargain. Also on



offer are pool villas, beach

apartments, terrace apartments and seaview apartments, all ranging from 3.75 million to 14.75 million baht.

Financed and marketed by European backers, the Thai Island Dream Estate is proceeding as scheduled, with model units complete and sales already underway.

Back on the mainland, the Krabi Garden Resort has begun construction on its hillside lot in Klong Muang.

This project is backed by investors in Sweden and offers seaview villas and apartments.

Construction is being undertaken by Swedish company Lindab, makers of high quality insulated wall units that are energy efficient, soundproof, resistant to mold and moisture, and easy to construct.

The prices in this development range from 3.8 million to 12.2 million baht for the

apartments, while the villas are priced from 6.6 million to 11.4 million baht.

With construction underway and two units complete, the project is well positioned to sell all 42 units on offer.

Also in Klong Muang is a Thai-backed condominium project called AT SEA Condos.

This is one of the few properly registered condominium projects in Krabi. Sales interest has been good.

Its lower priced units are seen as a fairly safe investment and are the right price for this economic environment.

Prices start at 1.69 million for a studio and go up to 3.6 million baht for a two-bedroom condominium.

With attractive seaviews, the studio apartments have sold out already.

Another Thai-financed project of interest is a private marina being built in the Ban Lampo section of Ao Nang.

Unlike several other private marina projects that exist on paper (and dreams) only, this land has been secured for years and construction has been ongoing for some time.

This 'green marina' will keep all the mangrove trees on the sea front, utilize a natural inlet for access and include botanical gardens and a retirement village.

This eco-friendly project is also blessed with thousands of rai of surrounding mangrove forest and ensures a quiet natural setting for its residents.

The projects mentioned, all planned or financed during the economic downturn, should be well placed for the economic recovery, providing an inventory to suit all market tastes.

Let's hope the rising tide of improved business lifts all our boats!

For giving the skin a glow, there are treatments such as Absolute Whitening, Mesotherapy and Dermaroller treatments.

Mesotherapy is a non-surgical cosmetic medicine treatment performed by injecting pharmaceutical and homeopathic medications such as plant extracts, vitamins, and other ingredients into the subcutaneous fat.

The injections target localized fat deposits, causing the fat cells to die.


The dermatologists at Puttharaksa Aesthetic are trained on a weekly basis to ensure they are kept up to date with the latest in skin care technology developments.

## **Emissions plan will hurt all**

### **Talking Planes**

f you have ever traveled to Phuket from Europe on a regular airline, be afraid – be very, very afraid.

Not for your safety of course but for you pocket.

Fat cat bureaucrats from the European Union are out to 'get' many airlines for their carbon emission contribution to global warming, but it will be you, the customer, who eventually pays the price through your ticket.

The EU has decided that from 2012 onwards, the Emissions Trading Scheme (ETS) for aviation will come into effect.

The ETS is a somewhat complicated cap and trade scheme that charges all airlines flying to, from and within the European Union zone for their CO2 emissions.

This means airlines like Thai Airways, which flies in and out of many European cities every day, will be charged for CO2 emissions when its aircraft enter European Union air space.

You might argue, "I don't fly to Europe very often, so it will not effect me".

Oh yes it will.

Australia and New Zealand – are already working on their own ETS schemes, as is Japan.

The whole idea is likely to snowball as other parts of the world basically retaliate against the European scheme, seen by many as a cash cow being created by the EU.

Put it this way: the International Air Transport Association (IATA), which represents over 230 airlines in 125 countries and has been vigorously opposing the ETS, estimates that by 2020, the ETS could cost the world's airlines up to US\$21.2 billion.

So who will eventually pick up this bill?

You and I.

The EU approach wouldn't be so bad if aviation was a huge contributor to CO2 emissions but contrary to what every rabid environmentalist would tell you, energy production and ground transport are major contributors to the world's CO2 emissions.

Aviation only contributes around two percent of CO2 emissions but because of the industry's high profile, it's an easy target for politicians and bureaucrats to aim at and make a few billion dollars on the side.

To combat this, the airline industry – based on 2005 CO2 emission levels - has committed to improving fuel efficiency by an average of 1.5 percent annually until 2020; stabilizing emissions from 2020 with carbon-neutral growth; and cutting emissions in half by 2050.

All of this might sound quite a long way off but you have to Other areas – Asia-Pacific, start somewhere. That somewhere includes alternative fuels such as biofuels.

In this regard, there are now well publicized biofuel experiments already undertaken by airlines like Virgin Atlantic and Air New Zealand, proving that flying an aircraft safely on biofuel is feasible, albeit still at an early stage of development and certainly nowhere near the point of flying commercially with it.

But progress is being made in some surprising places.

In the Middle East, for example, the Arab Air Carriers Organization (AACO) will be the first to deploy what is called an Aircraft Emissions Manager, the world's only monitoring, reporting and verification (MRV) software tool specially designed to accurately measure carbon emissions and fuel burn in tonnekilometers as per the new EU requirements.

All twelve AACO airlines have taken up the MRV developed by air transport IT specialist firm SITA.

Qatar Airways has recently completed the world's first commercial passenger flight powered by fuel made from natural gas.

An Airbus A340-600 made a six-hour flight on Rolls-Royce Trent 556 engines using a 50-50 blend of synthetic Gas to Liquids (GTL) kerosene and conventional oil-based kerosene fuel.

These are just some of the many measures being taken by the industry to develop alternative, cleaner burning, lower CO2 emissions initiatives to meet the demands of climate change.

Some airlines even carry handcuffs and strait jackets for such eventualities. The only saving grace is that punishment for such behavior can be quite severe. Paying the cost of a Boeing 747 diverting to an unscheduled airport to offload an offending passenger could turn out to be one very expensive extra drink.

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

## From Kata to Kabul and


Nations training officer stationed in ▲ Afghanistan, who is currently holidaying in Phuket, has been ordered not to return to her post in Kabul because of deteriorating security in the region.

Carol Kayed, 32, flew to

n American United Phuket in early November for a two week holiday and to catch up with old friends.

But after the UN ordered 600 of its 6,000 international staff serving in Afghanistan to be evacuated and relocated to safer sites, Miss Kayed's Phuket holiday looks certain to be extended.

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Miss Kayed lived in Kata, Phuket from 2006 until 2008, where she worked as an English Teacher at Katjonkiet and Banmaireab schools.

A life-long human rights campaigner, volunteer and aid worker, she was posted to the Afghan capital to serve as an English training officer in June last year.

Miss Kayed said she was uncertain of what exactly the relocation plans would mean for her, but speculated she may have to return to the US or be deployed to a UN safety zone 'somewhere' in the Middle East.

The relocation move came a week after suicide bombers, posing as police officers killed five UN foreign staff in central Kabul.

The UN Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) said last week, they were taking additional steps to reduce risks to its national and international staff serving in Afghanistan in light of the October 28 attack against UN staff in Kabul as well as further ongoing threats.

However, the relocation of foreign staff was played down by Secretary-General Ban Kimoon who rejected reports the UN was set to leave Afghanistan altogether.

Meanwhile, it has also been reported that the withdrawal of UN international staff has hampered US President Obama's counter-insurgency war strategy at a time his top commander in Afghanistan is calling for thousands of more troops to the region.

But news of the relocation comes as a severe blow to Western efforts to stabilize the country, and to Miss Kayed, who said she was 'devastated' she may have to leave her Afghan home and students behind but was 'content to be stranded in familiar surroundings in Phuket.'

In Kabul, the majority of

But being driven to work under armed guard each day and living under tight security in UN compounds didn't faze the bubbly training officer.

She said working with people who have endured 30 years of war and still wear a smile on their face was astonishing and made everything all worth while.

"My students would often bring a tear to my eye, and most of our English conversation classes would almost always come back to a war-related subject," she said.

"Many of my students had suffered and lost so much, but they still found a way to keep upbeat and we had some wonderful classes," she said.

Miss Kayed recalled one class when her oldest student, a 68 year-old white-bearded man happily joined in a 'head, shoulders, knees and toes sing-song.'

"He loved it and the whole class found it all hysterical," she said.

While Miss Kayed said teaching in Afghanistan is fulfilling, she added that she was the first female teacher her students ever had.

Under the Taliban regime,

women were not allowed to teach and girls were not allowed to attend school.

Heinous human rights violations were widespread, with women banned from seeing male doctors, laughing and listening to music.

Adding to this, they lived under prison like conditions where animals were seen of higher importance.

Public stoning for women caught having sex out of wedlock and fingers being cut off for wearing nail polish occurred regularly under Taliban rule.

But Miss Kayed said the fall of the Taliban in late 2001 was a historic turning point for Afghan women that saw a number of UNICEF-supported education programmes to train new Afghan teachers made available country-wide.

Miss Kayed says the effort to educate Afghan women teachers is making headway and was the reason she applied for her current UN role.

Women's rights and the role they play in modern day Afghan society seems to be continually getting better, she said.

"Although there are improvements, women are banned from driving and misogyny is still widespread."

Miss Kayed said corporal punishment is also still widely used in Afghan schools and children are often beaten by teachers with steel rulers.

However, Miss Kayed said efforts to stabilize insurgent attacks was an issue that was 'defiantely not making headway, adding that she was heartbroken when she heard of the most recent suicide bombings and deaths.

"Security and safety are constant concerns for all international staff but we often have to take a route where we travel on the most dangerous road in the world just outside Kabul."

A road, she said where bombings and kidnappings take place regularly.

Miss Kayed said heightened security measures to protect the Afghan people is what's needed.

"There are orphans everywhere on the streets of Kabul, living homeless and in constant danger."

"Kids take care of kids is the philosophy in Kabul, she said"

Miss Kayed said she is intent on going back to Afghanistan to help efforts to stabilize the country.

"With the relocation of international staff I can only hope that I will get to see my students again."

But, until she recieves word, she will have to stay on Phuket.

"Just now I'm stranded in paradise until I recieve my next orders," she said.

## **Colin Mackay**

While sitting in a local pub in my village in Cherngtalay after work, the warning "Here's trouble" inevitably signifies the arrival of Colin Mackay. These all-too-frequent visits usually occur during one of his legendary two-hour expeditions to order a pizza for his wife. Yet he lives but five minutes away.

Colin Mackay has spent the last three years writing a history of Phuket and the region, a huge task involving research from the earliest recorded history right up to today. It seems that unlike most of the Malay peninsula, Phuket was never colonized, primarily, according to a Spanish sea captain, because it was "one of the most dangerous and violent places known to the seafaring world.

"The Spanish Inquisitors had nothing on these lads," Colin says. "Many think the first Europeans to set foot on Phuket were the early tourists of the 1970s, but during the Ayutthaya period, which was drawing to a close about 200 years earlier, Phuket had two French governors."

The book is going to make an interesting read.

Colin arrived in Phuket in 1997 after a financially successful stint as a stockbroker in Hong Kong. At 50 baht to the U.S. dol-

lar, he bought a bit of land on the beach at Bang Tao and developed the first project in the north of the island, Ban Chai Nam.

Colin Mackay is a Scotsman (no surprise there). He was born in Kenya and grew up in Tanzania, which, according to him, justifies supporting South Africa in all sports, especially rugby – except when a contingent from that nation is playing Scotland. But if bets involving money are in play, he tends to stay with South Africa.

Colin studied in Edinburgh, earned a Masters in history, and got a job with Adventure Holidays as a guide on camel tours in the Sinai Desert. From there he journeyed overland towards Asia and Australia, ran white water rafting tours in Nepal and Australia, and finished up in Hong Kong as a photo-journalist. In the latter role, he did two stints as a war correspondent in Cambodia. It was as a journalist that he first found Phuket in 1986.

Back in Hong Kong, Colin says, "I decided to become a stock broker as the girls there weren't much interested in a journalist with an adventurous background."

According to legend, his stockbroking days yielded a lot of money in a fairly short time, so he left Hong Kong and went off

looking for shipwrecks where he indulged in treasure hunting.

This was a period during which he lived in the pirates' old hunting grounds, particularly the Dominican Republic where he learned to speak Spanish and developed a fondness for "poor countries with pretty girls."

When his treasure ran out he set up a venture capital fund in Austria and Russia, he says, investing in mining in Africa and South East Asia. In doing this he apparently made enough money to retire to Phuket, in 1997, for the primary purpose of writing history books.

He invested in the booming property market, with Ban Chai Nam and Surin Springs. Then came the very top-end Samsara, which became a victim of the great Phuket land "scandal", just before Colin was going to list his company on the Stock Exchange of Thailand.

"I felt like a hamster on an exercise wheel," he says, "so I got off it and went back to the history book."

He became president of the Hash House Harriers, "a club for drinkers with a running problem," and, of at least equal note, married his lawyer Anurak. They have a daughter, Skye.

After traveling the world for so many years Colin was finally able to settle down – to some extent. "If you're going to drink yourself to death," he says, "Phuket's as good as anywhere else to do it." – *Graham Doven*

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## Putting Spain on the map



here do the best supercars originate? The Italians have Ferrari, Maserati and Lamborghini; the Germans produce Mercedes-Benz and Audi; the French manufacture the frighteningly quick Bugatti Veyron; while the British develop the elegant Aston Martin.

But what about Spain?

Not the most likely contender, it's true, but a company in Valencia has produced the Iberian Peninsula's very own contender – the GTA Spano.

Experience in motorsport competition has been a key ingredient in the development of a car which features five world patents.

The chassis has been created combining Kevlar and carbon fibre as well as titanium.

The engine is an 8.3 litre, supercharged V10 mounted in a



longitudinal rear position, producing a massive 780bhp (574kW) and 920Nm of torque. A bio-ethanol conversion is an optional extra, which ups the power to 840bhp.

Top speed is a claimed 340km/h, while the benchmark 0-100km/h sprint takes less than three seconds.

The GTA features a sevenspeed sequential manual gearbox, with the option of an automatic system with paddle shift on the steering wheel.

The suspension comprises a 'double wishbone' configuration with adjustable shock absorbers to select 'ride hardness' and affords the possibility of raising

the bodywork over speed bumps.

The tires are the latest Pirelli P Zero set on specially developed wheels. The braking system features huge 380mm carbonceramic ventilated discs complete with six-piston callipers, while ABS is standard.

Directed by Domingo Ochoa, the GTA team manager, the project began three years ago and the company has now reached distribution agreements with many of the most relevant dealers in the world.

"We published the project for everyone one year ago after developing it technically and logistically for two years. Now, after hard and exhausting work, we are ready to show the results," Ochoa explained

"We are convinced it will be a car that will set a precedent on the international automobile scene."

After 15 years of elite-level automobile motorsport, GTA Motor decided to go one step further and make Ochoa's dream of building a supercar in Spain come true.

The result was a car that combines all the automobile technology with elegance and exclusivity.

The use of new technologies in several components led to a more ecological product than similar products currently on the market.

The company intends to use this technological transfer as the launch pad for a pioneering automobile industry in Spain.

Designed by GTA Motor's engineering director Sento Pallardó, a limited edition run of 99 GTA Spanos will be produced.

These 99 cars will boast the most advanced technology, innovative aesthetics, studied aerodynamics and a good number of solutions for the future, all of which are capable of competing with internationally prestigious brands in terms of image and performance.

distinguishing characteristics is its lateral view where the doors fit perfectly into the air intakes.

Apart from performing an aerodynamic function, these air intakes refrigerate elements such as oil coolers, power-assisted steering and the brakes.

Its design is original – yet another distinguishing mark of the concept.

Access to the interior is accomplished by pressing the GTA logotype, rendering it a more elegant design thanks to the lack of traditional handles.







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## Just missing the locals

Now in its fourth year, the Phuket Thailand Open beach volleyball tournament last week was the best and biggest ever, with 66 teams from 28 countries taking part.

There was a great deal of excitement during the third-place final, when a large contingent of Russian fans cheered Maria Bratkova and Evgenia Ukolova to an exciting win over Lauren Fendrick and Ashley Ivy of the US.

While the all-US final lacked the excitement of that match, it was nevertheless a masterful performance by world number one pairing of April Ross and Jen Kessy.

So good was it in fact that it left some in the crowd with the same feeling one gets when watching one of the Klitchko brothers dispatch challengers in boxing's heavyweight division: a strange mix of awe and apathy.

Despite the fact that entry to all of the exciting matches was free of charge, there were quite a few empty seats throughout the tournament, including the championship match.

A look in the stands throughout revealed that most of those who came out to enjoy the play were foreign tourists, not Thais.

All this begs the question: with such attractive, world-class athletes; excellent organization; strong pre-event publicity; a nice breezy venue and no admission charge, why hasn't the event – and beach volleyball in general – failed to really take off among Thais?

Some have suggested that it may be that Thailand lacks the kind of 'sporting culture' found in Western countries, but this is probably not the case.

Thais get just as riveted by sporting events as any other, provided they have a horse in the race.

Unfortunately, too many people in Phuket try to recreate this passion artificially, by betting on matches.

Getting back to beach volleyball, it is likely more Thais would have turned out to watch if the five Thai pairs were not eliminated from the competition so early on.

Another factor is the sun. While hanging out by the beach on a sunny day might be the Western definition of bliss, most Thais still see the fiery orb as something to curse, not worship. Perhaps playing at night under floodlights could be a partial solution.

Whatever the case, the Phuket Thailand Open continues to grow, and this year seven teams took part in an amateur event for hotel workers that ran concurrently and drew good crowds of supporters.

Next year event organizers Pentangle Promotions hopes to expand this amateur tournament and hold workshops at local schools to get more youth involved. These are positive steps in helping this fun and very healthy sport really take hold here. [see related column, facing page.]

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

#### Too many stairs

Regarding Dan Waites' editorial piece on wheelchair access to allow disabled persons to study the CCTV monitors at Phuket City Police station (Phuket Gazette, November 7), one thought immediately comes to mind: if a lift is too expensive, why was thought not given at an earlier stage to locating the monitors at ground level?

Lack of access for the disabled is common throughout Thailand.

A typical case in question are the new Immigration offices; empty useless space at ground level and a grand staircase to the upper levels.

Last year I arrived in a leg brace and had to rely on my girlfriend to deal with a friendly officer to renew my year's visa.

Similarly, I had to walk up to the third floor of the TOT offices in Chalong on crutches to complain about the lack of ADSL service.

At least it is a pleasure to shop at Central, where there are not only lifts, but wheelchairs provided.

As an architect in the UK, I would not even be allowed a 5cm step into any building.

Isn't it time some stringent regulations were enforced here?

## Building support for sport



## FIRST PERSON

For the past year, Daniel Ogunshakin has covered many of the island's world-class international sporting events for the Gazette and has become heavily involved in promoting the island's semiprofessional football team, Phuket FC. As a sports

enthusiast and promoter, the action on offer this past year has brought him great pleasure. However, rallying local support for sporting events on the island has been an uphill challenge. In this week's First Person, he outlines his views on Phuket's sporting environment.

rior to making the decision to move to Phuket and base myself here permanently, I had visited the island a couple of times and liked what I had seen.

Despite a lot of development, there were still some superb areas of natural beauty to enjoy, good scuba diving, a seemingly neverending choice of restaurants and bars, and many decent people.

There was one concern I did have: I believed there was a lack of live sporting action on the island.

I am a very passionate sports fan and take an interest in most sports. Indeed, I am at my happiest when watching, playing, talking about, listening to or reading about sport.

Some might say I am obsessed and, to be honest, they might have a point. But if it makes me happy, what's the problem?

Coming from England and having spent 18 months of my life living in Australia, two countries where watching live sport is ingrained in the culture, I felt I might have had trouble adjusting to the presumed sport-free life here on the island.

Arriving at the end of October last year, I was immediately greeted by the SWATCH FIVB World Tour Thailand Open volleyball on Karon Beach, shortly followed by the Phuket King's Cup Regatta, the Laguna Phuket Triathlon and the four-team King's Cup tournament between Thailand, Lebanon, Denmark and North Korea.

People might turn their nose up at the standard of the opposition of the tournament, but, to underline the quality taking part, Denmark and North Korea would later go on to qualify for the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa.

Since those first few months, I have had the pleasure of attending many more international-standard events, none more so than the 2009 Singha Thailand Open golf tournament held at Laguna Phuket Golf Course back in March.

Here was an event that attracted the very best of the Asian Golf Tour to our shores along with a two-time winner on the USPGA tour, the hardest tour there is for professional golfers.

With my fears of a lack of sport to enjoy assuaged, I was thrown another gift with the announcement of the creation of Phuket FC and its entry into the Thai league system.

I, along with a colleague, decided to throw myself fully behind the new team, and even established a supporters group with the view to generating a fan base for the Sea Dragons; people who would turn out for matches and create some atmosphere.

Working for the Gazette, I have had the privilege of observing all of the aforementioned events and have been able to get behind the scenes and interview players, coaches and officials alike.

Sadly, what it has also shown me is that few people in Phuket seem to appreciate how good they have it here, the one exception being the King's Cup final where 16,000 raucous fans filled Surakul Stadium.

I appreciate that not everyone enjoys sport as much as I do, but have still been disappointed by the lack of enthusiasm shown.

Access to top-class sport is generally hard to come by, particularly if you are in the UK.

Fans are often required to be members of clubs to have the chance of getting tickets and are then still asked to pay often huge fees to see the sport they love.

Here in Phuket, it is quite the opposite. Many of the sporting events on the island are free for spectators - the recent 2009

volleyball tournament for example – and those that aren't require just a small financial outgoing.

What impressed me most

this year was that the Thailand Open golf was free, but, despite this, crowds were relatively sparse.

Compare that if you will to the 2010 British Open to be held at St Andrew's in Scotland.

Tickets for all four day's play will cost you 12,500 baht, plus a further 12,500 baht if you wish to reserve a place around the 18th green, for example. An expensive few days out, but you can guarantee the course will be chockablock.

While I would never argue that the two tournaments are of equal stature, I have to wonder why people aren't willing to watch the biggest golf tournament in sunny Thailand for free, when thousands are willing to spend a small fortune to stand a good chance of getting soaked in Scotland?

The problem, I believe, lies in the lack of pre-event coverage on the island.

This isn't the case with every event; some are marketed excellently, especially the Thailand Open, but more could be done to make people aware of what is going on around them.

People I have spoken to said

they would attend more events if they were made aware of them and surely this has to be the responsibility of the event organizers and the Tourism Authority of Thailand.

They need to saturate the island with information to ensure that everybody - Thais, expats and tourists alike - are aware of the top-class sporting action unfolding around them.

Those behind Phuket FC must ensure that the island's expat community and tourists are informed, in English, when matches will take place; currently all advertising is conducted in Thai.

As sports editor at the Gazette, I have tried to publicize events to the full extent of my ability in a bid to reach as many people as possible.

This is particularly the case with Phuket FC, but, judging from the number of people in the stadium, clearly I have work to do.

Ultimately, it's not my responsibility to ensure the island's sporting events and teams are well supported, but as a resident of the island and a sports fan, I like to help.

I will continue to support the events every way I can and hope that, one day, people will start to join me.

## What are the things that give you a mild sting in the water and what can be done to prevent being stung?

The sting is not strong enough to force us to leave the water, but my friends and I have been arguing about the cause of the stinging for years.

Some say jellyfish and others say a protective device for drifting fish eggs.

It also seems to float at the surface of the water.

Can you ask a marine biologist what causes the stinging sensation and is there anything that can be done to prevent it?

> Most often, the 'sea lice' feeling (basically that niggly, itchy, scratchy and slightly painful feeling) that people get in tropical waters comes from a mixture of small jellyfish and/or jellyfish pieces.

These are the typical 'jelly buttons' or hydromedusae, as they are more scientifically called.

There are literally many hundreds of species which fall into this category, and usually they are only annoying, but not dangerous.

However, in many parts of the world, including Thailand, Irukandji jellyfish also

what starts out to seem like a minor irritant can become quite even (or especially) if the sting dangerous indeed.

We don't know why they hang out together, just that

Furthermore, many Irukandji stings actually feel like sea lice in the beginning, so you don't even know the difference until it's really throwing you for

A good method of protection from these mild irritants and from something more severe like an Irukandji, is to wear a lycra or neoprene suit (dive skin, stinger suit or wetsuit).

Both protect well from all types of jellyfish stings by covering the majority of the body.

If stung, the best treatment is to flush the area with vinegar, seems fairly mild.

If it's an Irukandji sting (and you won't know it for another half an hour), it will stop the envenomation process so that you won't take on any more venom.

If it's nothing, it won't do you any harm.

## The need to diversify reserves

he recent decision by the Indian Central Bank to buy 200 metric tonnes of gold from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) took the gold market by surprise.

It also propelled gold to an all time record high.

The IMF needed cash – and a substantial amount of it at that – to fund its assistance programs to countries in trouble after the financial crisis.

The 200 metric tonnes sold to India is only half the amount the IMF is actually selling. Many market participants believe gold buying by other central banks will account for the remainder.

This gold never actually appeared for sale in the market; it was a direct transaction between the parties involved.

Everybody in the gold market knows that India is the biggest importer of gold in the world – the Indian wedding season in the Northern Hemisphere's autumn is well known for creating massive demand.

However, demand for the yellow metal in India in 2009 was down 30 percent year-on-year.

The reasons behind this fall in demand are the slowdown of the Indian economy as a result of the global financial crisis and the high price of gold, which has encouraged many to sell their traditional gold bracelets.

The central bank of India had another reason – reserve asset diversification.

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India now has substantial

foreign exchange reserves running into hundreds of billions of dollars. The gold purchases cost about 6.7 billion dollars – a very small percentage of overall holdings.

India is not alone in having large foreign exchange reserves. China has the largest reserves at well over US\$2 trillion, followed

China and Russia may shout about the amount of US dollars they have in their foreign exchange reserves, but all countries with large reserves have the same problem; the need to diversify.

For any holder of substantial amounts, the problem of how to hold these massive reserves soon comes to the fore.

Simply put, a central bank with large foreign exchange reserves can only place so much in euros, for example, as the majority of the amount held ends up in Euro Zone's bond market.

This creates its own problems.

The countries that make up the Euro Zone can only absorb a certain amount of cash, especially when the central banks owning these reserves effectively want to hold liquid assets.

The US has the world's largest bond market and liquidity is a real concern for central banks. This is why a very large proportion of foreign exchange reserves eventually end up in US dollars.

This year, many predicted that the US dollar would be weak. These predictions have come to pass, but fears of a US dollar meltdown have proven to be unsubstantiated.

In the world of currencies, many unexpected events take place, but a meltdown of the US dollar is probably one of the more unlikely scenarios.

It is fashionable to deride the 'Greenback', but when the financial crisis reached its peak in the third and fourth quarters of 2008, panic money found its way into US Treasuries.

That was then looked upon as being the haven of last resort.

Much of the US dollar's weakness in 2009 can be attributed to a realization that the world is not going into financial meltdown and investments in other areas and currencies have continued. As risk appetite returns, funds have been moving out of the dollar.

Substantial deficits in the US are one of the biggest reasons for arriving at the conclusion the dollar is going to weaken.

It is certainly true that the budget deficit is enormous - the Economist Intelligence Unit believes it will reach 11.9 percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) this year. This is some way from the maximum three percent that the IMF recommends as sustainable.

However, the 'sustainable' is the key. America's budget deficit will certainly not be at this level every year. This has been a huge crisis – by far the largest since World War Two and policy response had to match the size of the problem.

Additionally, when countries are in recession, income from taxation drops substantially.

America is showing signs of healing – GDP for the third quarter of 2009 reflected economic growth at an annualized rate of 3.5 percent.

Much of this growth was the result of stimulus measures and probably reflects an artificially high level.

However, it is growth and that means that the US is out of recession.

For years analysts have noted that the US is running large deficits, but the deficits that have caused concern have usually been the trade deficit and the more encompassing current account deficit.

Again using the Economist Intelligence Unit's statistics, the current account deficit for 2009 is only expected to account for three percent of GDP – even the IMF will not raise its hypothetical eyebrows at that figure.

Simply put, the recession caused the levels of imports into the US to drop substantially.

Providing that the US Federal Reserve can navigate the slow removal of excess liquidity from the economy, America can stay out of recession.

It is not going to be an easy task but one reality still exists: the US government is having no problems finding investors for new issues of Treasury Bills.

According to Frances, "They all get on very well with one another, probably because they are all very spoiled," she said.

Of the 53 snakes, most live in tanks, but a few have supervised free roam of the house.

One of the lucky few is Wallace, a 12-foot long Burmese python, who has taken up residence in the downstairs bathroom.


"He likes to sit on the sofa and watch TV and sometimes he will even sleep in the bed with me," Frances said.

"He has got a liver disease and has to be fed with a tube."

"Blood pythons are not aggressive, they live in creeks and feed on rats. Its jaw was broken in three places and we think they must have used a machete.

"She can't go back in the wild because she can't feed herself, I have to feed her by putting a tube down her throat."

As a child in Australia, Frances kept pet lizards, but she didn't discover her love of snakes until she met her husband Kevin, who used to keep snakes in his native South Africa.

A year after arriving in Phuket she got her first snake, a ball python.



'Wat' is a three-year-old green tree python from Sarong in the western tip of New Guinea.

"That was four years ago and at the time we only thought we would have the one, but it just grew from there," she said.

Twenty eight of the snakes we have now belong to us, five are being treated for various ailments for the Cobra Show and the rest we are just babysitting for a friend."

Frances feels the threat humans pose to snakes far outweighs the threat snakes pose to humans.

"Snakes don't bite unless they are really upset – if someone is trying to catch or kill them, for example," she said.

"They are more scared of

us than we are of them. If you find a snake in the house do not try to box it in, just leave it alone and it will probably leave of its own accord."

There are a number of snakes indigenous to Phuket, including vipers and three different types of cobra.

Cobras are dangerous to humans and are very common in Phuket, but Frances said it is not something we should worry too much about.

"Snakes are extremely reluctant to bite. If they are going to bite you they will normally warn you first," she said.

"Cobras can also bite without releasing their venom. All the hospitals in Phuket have antivenom and it is extremely rare for anyone to die of a snake bite."

Realistically, you are more likely to encounter venomous snakes at the many cobra shows on the island than in the wild. Frances works closely with these shows.

"The cobra show will ring us up if they have injured or sick snakes and we will take care of

"At the moment they don't have the time or the knowledge to take care of the snakes by themselves, but they want to learn and we are trying to teach them."

Frances will not allow venomous snakes in the house. All her snakes are either boas or pythons, neither of which are venomous, but this does not stop her helping the cobra shows take care of their venomous snakes.

"Kevin and I went and showed them how to give medicine to the King Cobras for their stomach parasites. We also fed them by tube as they were very undern-ourished (King Cobras normally eat snakes, but don't complain about chicken mince), which was pretty scary," she said.

"They would have died if we hadn't helped them though and King Cobras are a protected species."


Frances wants people to realize that, not only are snakes mostly harmless, they also provide a valuable public service.

"Snakes are an essential part of the ecology. They eat rodents and without snakes there would be rats everywhere," she said.

"There are already too many rats in Phuket."

## **Ancient Aussies beat Vagabonds**

ETERSHAM Rugby Club from Sydney, Australia brought their season to a close in Phuket on October 30, recording a convincing 42-17 win over the Phuket Vagabonds.

EIGNING world and Thailand Open champions Jen Kessy (formerly Jen Boss) and April Ross beat all-comers for the second consecutive year to claim victory at the FIVB Women's Volleyball World Tour in Karon.

The dominant American duo retained their title thanks to a routine straight sets win over compatriots Angie Akers and Tyra Turner.

In recent times, teams from America have dominated the Karon competition.

2009 was no exception.

Just as it was in 2007 and 2008, this year's final was an all-American affair, almost mimicking last year's gold medal match between Ross and Kessy, and Turner and Nicole Branagh.

There was a good turn out to witness the finals, but the atmosphere suffered during the final because of the lack of international competition.

In the first set of the match, both pairs made a series of unforced errors as they struggled to find their rhythm.

Once the hugely experienced duo found their groove, they jumped into an early lead.

Akers and Turner fought hard to claw their way back into the first set, but the defending champions never looked in danger of being caught, closing out the first set 21-12.

The second set proved to be a much closer affair, but the reigning champions had too much in their arsenal for Turner and Akers and were able to clinch the second set 21-17 to take the title and the winner's cheque for US\$30,000.

Sunday's final was the seventh FIVB meeting between the two pairings. Kessy and Ross have yet to lose a match against Akers and Turner, boasting a perfect 7-0 record.

After the final and the awards ceremony, Ross was jubilant about the win.

"It was a very tough tournament because of the heat. It starts to take its toll once you have played a few games," she said.

"Angie and Tyra are good friends and we will all be going out together tonight, but on the court it is all about business and we came up on top.

"We love Phuket and the sand on Karon Beach is fantastic. We are both torn between coming here to play volleyball and coming here on vacation, and we have to find a balance."

In the bronze medal match, Russian duo Maria Bratkova and Evgenia Ukolova became the first team from Russia to win a medal on the SWATCH FIVB World Tour as they dispatched Lauren Fendrick and Ashley Ivy, also of the USA, to prevent an

American clean sweep.

The 22nd seeds overcame their opponents 15-21, 22-20 and 15-9 in 55 minutes to claim the bronze medal and a share of US\$15,000.

huket has a global reputation for its maritime activities, thanks largely to the King's Cup, Phuket Race week and several prestigious marinas filled with exotic yachts and motor cruisers of all shapes and sizes.

Aside from the crammed passenger speedboats that bounce off to James Bond Island or Koh Phi Phi full of lily white soon-to-become-lobster-red tourists and a few launches lowered from the backs of super yachts, there are few quality recreational speed-boats in Phuket on which to enjoy island hopping, go snorkeling or to use to discover coves, beaches and inlets where the tourist masses never get to.

Few, that is, until recently. Chris Craft boats were established in 1874 by Chris Smith in Michigan, USA. Smith was putting the first engines in boats at the same time Henry Ford was creating his first motor cars.

Originally, the boats were made entirely from mahogany. This continued until the late

sixties, at which point fibreglass technology began to replace it. The last traditional wooden Chris Craft was made in 1972.

Aside from winning many racing accolades, Chris Craft boats have been bought by three American Presidents as well as Hollywood stars Dean Martin, Elvis Presley, Katherine Hepburn and Frank Sinatra – to name but a few.

It was early on a Thursday morning when I left Boat Lagoon with Olly Wingate, an experienced global mariner in many different craft and the manager of Chris Craft Thailand, to put the Chris Craft Corsair 28 though its paces – as they say the proof of the pudding is in the tasting.

The craft sits low in the water with sleek lines, the dark blue hull contrasting with the lush hide-colored interior, something more akin to a luxury stretch limo than a speedboat.

Stepping aboard, the boat hardly tipped, no doubt due to three and a half tonnes of wellbalanced construction.

The engines emitted a low, muffled sound and we cruised out into the channel, heading towards Phang Nga Bay. We cut through

wakes of boats returning without so much as a bump or a splash, and as we neared the end of the channel and our speed picked up, we cornered effortlessly through the bends.

It felt and drove like a luxury car equipped with the latest high-tech suspension.

As we entered the bay, Olly merely touched the electronically driven throttle and we accelerated smoothly

and effortlessly up to a steady 50

As I sat in the rear seats, my water bottle not moving from the inbuilt teak table, I was able to have a perfectly normal conversation without bellowing at one of my fellow passengers across the table – this despite the fact that the engines were only a meter away.

The deck space around the table was ample for six adults, while the passenger seat next to the driver, with its view of the

boat's long teak-lined front deck, provided the perfect foreground for a beautiful 270-degree view of Phang Nga Bay.

The sun became much stronger and we raised the bimini (a sunshade for you land lubbers), electronically controlled and effortless, providing ample shade for all on board.

At the same time we looked at the engine compartment. The twin 5.7 liter 280hp engines looked stylish and powerful.

Taking the helm, the responsiveness of the controls and steering was immediate.

All electronically controlled, the propellers turn with the gearbox, giving immediate response and total control – just like driving a luxury car.

The instrument panel is clear and well laid out, affording enough spare polished chrome space for extra equipment.

The ride itself was as smooth as silk. I have been on many a craft where you jolt with every ripple, and experience a good salt water wash whenever you hit a wave – not in a Chris

The deep V-shaped hull with a flared bow provides a smooth, stable and dry ride.

The hull is thickly insulated so when you do encounter waves at speed the effect is dampened, contributing to the smoothness, even in choppy

Other features include a double berth cabin with a flushing toilet underneath the foredeck (essential for ladies on board), stainless steel and teak finishes, 132-liter fresh water tank for showering down after a swim.

There's also ample storage for all of your equipment and the essential refrigeration unit.

The fuel capacity is a massive 568 liters, giving the boat a range of 231 miles at cruising speed.


Before going on the Chris Craft I read that the uniqueness of this boat is in its craftsmanship and design.

Being a skeptic, I thought, 'lets see', but now I have tasted the pudding I can confirm that it tastes good. All the hype is true and I am a convert.

The Corsair 28 retails at US\$249,000, ready to drive away fully Thai flagged.

The other members of the fleet start at US\$149,000.

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#### **Construction Update**

#### Mai Khao

## Convention center 'a certainty'

huket's decades-old dream of having an international-class convention and exhibition center took another turn on November 6, when Deputy Prime Minister Korbsak Sabhavasu toured the proposed project site in Mai Khao and suggested a number of changes to the latest plan.

Mr Korbsak, Pitak Direksuntorn, director of the Treasury Department's State Property Management and Services Office, reaffirmed that Cabinet has approved 2.6 billion baht in funding for the project.

However, the existing design may have to be changed depending of the results of the Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) process, he said.

Mr Korbsak, a Democrat Party member, said he was unhappy with certain elements of the project design as presented by Pitak Direksuntorn, director of the Treasury Department's State Property Management and Services Office.

Under the latest design, the project would be built on 150 rai of Treasury Department land at the island's northern tip near Tah Chat Chai village.

The Treasury Department initially requested 3.74 billion baht for the project, Mr Pitak said.

When Cabinet approved just 2.6 billion baht the project needed to be scaled back, so one of four exhibition halls and a hotel were axed from the initial design, Mr Pitak explained.

"When we get the rest of expected budget, the fourth exhibition hall and hotel will be built," he said.

Part of the 210-day EIA process involves a series of public hearings. When that is completed, the two-year construction period could begin, he said.

Under this time frame, if the EIA begins at the start of 2010, the project would be completed around July 2012.

Under the current plan, the construction would be carried out by King Mongkut's Institute of Technology, Ladkrabang campus.

After completion, contracts to administer the facilities would be awarded to private firms on a concessionary basis, Mr Pitak said.

Mr Korbsak questioned the reasoning behind putting a university in charge of the construction of the project

He suggested using one of the five private-sector construction firms who tendered bids for construction of the new Parliament building in the capital instead. "I think that would be more professional," he said.

Mr Korbsak also expressed concern about the environmental impact of the project.

He questioned the need for an underground car park and a hotel at the site and said he felt saddened that the natural beauty of the area would diminished.

He also asked that damage to existing vegetation be minimized.

"The project design should better match the existing landscape, perhaps with a small park or promenade," he said.

Asked if the Mai Khao site would definitely be the location, Mr Korbsak said he was '1,000 percent' certain it would be.

"I know Phuket people really want the international convention center in Phuket...I guarantee it is going to happen.

"The project has already been passed by the cabinet, so it can proceed even if the government changes," he said.

The Mai Khao site has many detractors who say it is too far from the main population centers and could end up like the underused 'Welcome Gate' visitors' center nearby.

## You made your bed, now lie in it

fter breaking their Thai host's bed in a 'good ol' fashioned pillow fight' last week, a visiting Northern Irish couple have been busy building a new bed made entirely from bamboo.

Personal trainer Johnny Owen, 27 and beauty specialist Lucia Macallion, 25 are in Phuket for a month's vacation, a trip they have made annually for the past three years.

Usually opting to stay at flash-packer hotels in Kata and Karon, this time round they decided they wanted something a bit more 'rough and ready'.

Renting a quaint wooden house close to Nai Harn Beach

from an 'adorable' Thai lady, the pair said they 'found a slice of Phuket life to call their own' on this year's vacation.

But after their bed-breaking incident, branded a 'moments madness' by Johnny, the two were left with a bed snapped in half, and some explaining to do to their sweet Thai landlady. Tails between their legs, the two vowed they would purchase a new bed. However, countless trips to bed stores around Phuket proved

"They were either out of our budget or just ghastly to look at," said Johnny.

Tired, sunburnt and shopped-out from trawling furniture stores, Johnny said it was when he stopped at a traffic light

on Chao Fa West road, that the solution came to him to build his own bed from bamboo.

"There was a man, fixing the traffic lights atop of a ladder made of bamboo, and across the street there was building construction being carried out with bamboo being used as scaffolding," he said.

A quick stop-off at an internet café, two mocha's, some research, and few scrawled sketches later and Johnny had a rough plan for his bed with sizes needed for bamboo. Finding a bamboo yard Johnny was quoted an astounding 320 baht for the 50 meters of bamboo he needed to make his queen size bed.

However getting it delivered was no easy feat. Promises of

next-day delivery were soon dispelled as the next day came and went and a very unhappy Johnny still had no bamboo.

Eventually having to drive

the delivery truck himself, Johnny's 50 meters of bamboo finally arrived. The great bamboobed-build was ready to start...

The following first person account is from Johnny. In his infinite Irish selflessness, the cheeky chappy has provided the following guide to building a bamboo bed. He hopes unfortunate fellow bed-breakers or readers who are just in need of a hobby, will find his account useful.

√irst, I assorted my 50 meters of bamboo into the different sizes needed: four side pieces measuring 220cm, four 200cm pieces for the foot and head of the bed, 12 x 30cm pieces for the feet and decoration of the headboard and 15 x 200cm for the bed slats.

As these were covered in dust, dirt and dead leaves, I cut the protruding offenders off with a machete and furiously sanded the bamboo shoots down. With them now smooth and showing the beauty of their natural color I painted all the bamboo with a rust coloured wood stain. This added to the beauty of the bamboo, green mixing with red into a vibrant oriental styled coloring.

The disadvantage to staining the wood is the time it takes to dry, in this instance 24 hours.

I returned the next day to begin phase two: 'operation protect bed'. I had recently purchased some fabric which I attached using glue and bands to the end of each piece of bamboo, (photo 2) as a way of dissuading any creatures from setting-up home. This task now out of the way there was only one thing left to do: operation 'bedbuild'.

Immediately I ran into trouble. The chances of all the bamboo being perfectly straight are impossible as it had grown and bent out of shape, swayed and stretched by the wind and elements. Compounding the problem was that once cut, bamboo becomes incredibly sturdy and difficult to balance one beam on top of the other.

This hampered my lashing technique which was also proving

error strewn. A friend had loaned me a copy of a British Special Air Service Survival Handbook which had a section on lashing and binding. As good as the guide may be for those living deep within enemy territory, it proved ineffective, as the incredibly strong fishing line I had bought continually slipped free once tension was applied.

I remedied this by tying a simple sailing knot, a bowline, in one end and whilst holding the two poles in place, looped in the knotless end, around and through the aforementioned loop.

The internet had failed me in trying to find lashing techniques so I left my fates up to trial and error.

I experimented and decided on a figure of eight mixed with a looping around the poles needing to be bound (photo 1).

My only problem now was how to create enough tension on the fishing line to minimise any

further movement.

Finding an old pestle I discovered the answer to my problem. Wrapping the fishing line around the pestle, I found that I could easily put high pressure on the binding whilst I lashed the poles together. This proved the perfect accompaniment to my newly acquired lashing technique and soon the base of my bed was tightly lashed together. I stood back and admired the shell of what was to come. Even if it all fell apart right now, at least I'd had the testicular fortitude to give it a shot, I thought.

The next step was to attach the bed slats. As these sections of bamboo were only 3cm in diameter there would need to be 12 horizontal slats and three

vertical or else the bed frame wouldn't be able to cope with the mattress, two farang and whatever else may occur when the bed was

Rather than attach them all to the now complete base frame, I lashed the three vertical poles to attach to the head and foot of the bed, spacing them at regular intervals so as to offer greater weight distribution when the horizontal slats were attached.

Rather than attaching the horizontal slats directly onto the base frame, I constructed the top frame and attached the 12 slats, equally spaced, to this instead.

The top frame was then placed on top of the base frame as you might imagine a sandwich (the base frame and top frame being the bread) and the filling being the slats.

Once bottom and top were lashed I set about the arduous and fiddly task of lashing the now joined horizontal slats to the vertical slats wherever they crossed paths (36 places as it happens).

It was tedious work but eventually my bed frame was complete. For dressing, you can tie rope around the corners of the bed for a more authentic feel. Also, a mattress usually helps.
