Family beaten in taxi spat

HALONG Police are on the hunt for a man thought to be a 'tuk-tuk or a taxi driver' who allegedly set upon a French family with a beach umbrella shaft in the Kata area on December 26.

The family, an elderly couple on holiday with their 44-year old son, his wife and their three children aged 14 months, seven and nine years old, claim they were attacked when they parked their rented car along the Kata Beach road.

The family claims they were confronted by a man outside the Karon Municipality offices, at the southern end of Kata Beach. vehicle, the family said.

After checking the area for no-parking signs, and seeing none, the family refused to move their car and began unloading their beach items.

Moments later, the man returned and assaulted them with the shaft of a beach umbrella, breaking the 44-year-old man's arm. The 68-year-old father also sustained bruises in the attack.

Many people saw the incident, which occurred at about 5pm, but no-one went to the family's aid, the victims claimed.

The family escaped in their car, stopping at the Kata Palm

He told them to move the Resort to recover from their ordeal. Staff at the resort alerted paramedics.

> The family reported the attack to police on Sunday. On December 29 Chalong police invited the victims to study police file photos of known criminals in the area of the attack.

> As this newspaper went to print, the victims had identified their male attacker and police were conducting searches for him in Kata. Police were also appealing to the suspect and witnesses to present themselves at Chalong Police Station.

Phuket's public transport shortcomings have been the

subject of bitter complaints from local residents and foreign tourists for at least a decade.

The complaints have intensified sharply this month.

Following a story by the Phuket Gazette on Dec 12, in which taxi drivers were alleged to have threatened staff and tour company representatives at the four-star Centara Karon Resort, the Gazette's on-line forum saw the first in what has turned out to be several hundred complaints from angry expat residents and foreign tourists.

Thailand unites to remember tsunami victims

HE fifth anniversary of the 2004 Indian Ocean Tsunami united thousands of tourists and locals at remembrance services in Phuket and Phang Nga provinces on December 26.

They came in honor of the 5,395 lives that were lost in six southern Thai provinces five years ago.

In Phuket, services were held at Patong, Kamala and Mai Khao beaches. In Phang Nga, residents of Kuk Kak released 2,552 lanterns into the night sky, one for each victim of the tsunami in that community. More on page four.

TOT rolls out the fiber

OT has launched a new fiber optic internet service in Phuket. Starting at 8,600 baht per month, the long-awaited 'Fiber To You' service offers internet speeds of 10-20 megabits per second.

TOT President Varut Suvakorn said the state-owned company invested 200 million baht to install its 'fiber to the x' (FTTx) network in selected parts in each of Phuket's three districts: Muang, Kathu and Thalang.

The service will connect to 3,200 ports initially, but can be expanded to 20,000 ports. Around 100 hotels and expats have already expressed interest in installing Fiber To You, Mr Varut said.

The venture will bring in annual revenues of 30-50 million baht with annual growth of 10 to 20%, he estimates. TOT plans to recoup its capital investment in three years and seven months.

Services will include highspeed Internet as well as other applications, such as VOIP, Live TV and video on demand. Phuket's large expat community is the major target group.

"Fiber [optic cables] can increase the service speed to more than 100 megabits per second. TOT will work on building knowledge among consumers about the difference in quality when compared to ADSL. IT and software businesses based in Phuket can take full advantage of the new service and be completely confident in its stability," Mr Varut said.

Mr Varut said that the

industrial estates of the Eastern Seaboard and cities including Hua Hin would be the next areas for the rollout of Fiber To You services, with work starting in the first quarter of 2010.

TOT will market Fiber To You service directly and in-directly, by leasing network access to outside vendors. To meet the increased bandwith requirements, TOT will expand its international gateway and rent additional bandwidth from CAT.

Bus station built, no one in charge

HE opening of Phuket's new 128-million-baht bus station is on hold while authorities work out which organization will be put in charge of its operation.

Structural work on the station was completed earlier this month, with project contractor Anda Phuket Construction Co Ltd officially handing the structure over to the Land Transport Department on December 4.

No date for the station's opening has been announced, however, because the agency is still negotiating with both Rasada Tambon Administration Organization (TAO) and the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO) over which, if either, body will be put in charge of its operation.

Work on the station began in September 2008, after the Land Transport Department paid 80 million baht to acquire the nine-rai plot from a private landowner. The station is located on Thepkrasattri Rd southbound, just south of Supercheap in Rasada District.

Anda Phuket project engineer Boonlert Pikulthong told the *Gazette* the work was completed within the contract cost of 47.98 million baht.

"After we signed the contact in September last year we started right away just to make sure we could finish and hand over the project before the December 12 deadline," he said. Work was finished within project spec-

ifications, and no further changes are needed, he said.

Phuket Land Transport Officer Kanok Siripanichkorn declined to estimate when control of the station will be transferred, but confirmed the two bodies under consideration are the Rasada TAO and the PPAO.

The agency is still waiting for both bodies to confirm their intent to run the terminal before making the final decision and consigning the terminal over to the chosen organization, he said.

The new station, officially designated as Phuket Bus Terminal 2, comprises two main sections: a covered platform with drive-up parking for 29 buses, and a two-story passenger building.

"We plan to install an escalator and set up an air-con section for passengers waiting to depart, but we still have to work out the details with the organization

that agrees to run it," he said.

In a bid to boost domestic tourism, the Land Transport Office plans to establish several new, long-haul provincial bus routes in mid-2010, he revealed.

These will include routes to Pattaya, Nongkhai and either Betong District in Yala or Su-ngai Kolok in Narathiwat, both on the Malaysian border.

The biggest problem associated with the opening of the new station will be increased traffic congestion on Thep-krasattri Rd, because buses going off the island will first have to head south then do a U-turn, he said. It is hoped the Phuket Provincial Highways Office will soon build an elevated horseshoe-shaped U-Turn channel to allow buses to make an aerial crossing over Thep-krasattri Rd and head north without obstructing traffic flow.

Police conduct surprise drug tests on bar staff

O keep Patong free of drugs, Kathu Police have adopted a new strategy that focuses on a method of random drug testing for nightclub staff.

Kathu Police Superintendent Grissak Songmoonnark said that Kathu is compiling lists of staff from participating nightclub owners in order to conduct surprise urine testing to see if staff test positive for *ya bah* (methamphetamine).

The common test regimen

involves adding a reagent to the urine samples. If the urine turns purple, the person is considered to be positive for *ya bah*.

Under the new strategy club owners will call their workers for a staff meeting at which the surprise tests will be conducted. This will put an end to the need for having to raid clubs during peak hours with officials from a number of different agencies, he said.

Col Grissak said the project

is already underway and working well. Those who test positive, both Thai and foreigners, are instructed to seek treatment, he said.

The new strategy is based on the assumption that most people who seek out narcotics source them from staff at nightclubs and other entertainment venues, he said.

"If we keep the clubs drugfree, tourists will find it hard to buy them," he said.

'black plate' taxis

OURISTS disembarking at Phuket International Airport on December 22 encountered even more highseason chaos than usual, as police erected a new checkpoint there in an attempt to crack down on illegal 'black plate' taxis.

Phuket International Airport Director Prathueng Sornkham held a meeting at the airport the day before to announce the crackdown, which he said was put in place at the request of the Ministry of Tourism and Sports, following complaints from tourists.

The crackdown began, when Wing Commander Pra-thueng was joined by Phuket Land Transport Office Director Kanok Siripanichakorn, Tha Chat Chai Police and Tourist Police in setting up a checkpoint at the exit gate of the airport to check for private cars carrying paying customers.

"Most of the complaints are from tourists, who say the black plate drivers annoy them by taking them on shopping tours against their will, and pestering them to buy things they don't want or need. Some of them fall victim to scams," he said.

The crackdown will continue, he said.

"From the information we have, we think there are now about 200 illegal taxis operating here," he added.

Mr Prathueng said with close to 100,000 passengers

transiting through the airport every month, the problem needed to be solved.

The only ones left out of the loop, it seems, were tourists. Many were forced to wait about 30 minutes with no idea what was going on while authorities interrogated their drivers.

Black plate taxis have long operated clandestinely at the airport. All taxis legally picking up fares from the airport must pay the Airports of Thailand (AoT), which has a concession arrangement with the Phuket Mai Khao Company to run sedan limousines onto AoT property.

Metered taxis are also allowed onto AoT grounds, but must pay a flat fee per fare.

In both case, the costs are passed on to passengers. Both limousine drivers and metered taxis have long complained that taxi syndicates controlling other parts of the island make it impossible for them to pick up return passengers, further increasing their fuel costs and driving up fares.

One 'black taxi' driver told the Gazette he was only reacting to passenger demand by supplying transport to and from the airport at true market value. Most of his customers were either friends or repeat customers that called him when they needed transport to or from the airport.

Airport crackdown on Child labor 'not a big problem' in Phuket

ORKPLACE inspections by the Phuket Provincial Labor Protection Office have found that minors make up a very small fraction of the Phuket workforce.

At a meeting at the Phuket Provincial Labor Protection Office chaired by Phuket Vice Governor Tri Augkaradacha on December 23, it was revealed that inspection tours in fiscal 2009 discovered 24 unregistered workers under the age of 18.

The Woman and Juvenile Workers Assistance Center inspected 571 businesses with a total of 16,255 workers: 7,682 adult males; 8,549 adult females and 24 unregistered minors.

The Woman and Juvenile Workers Assistance Center will try to get all 24 youths registered with the Labor Protection Office.

There are currently 62 firms employing 115 legally registered employees under 18, the meeting was told.

Inspections of 74 bus-

inesses during the first two months of fiscal 2010 found a total of 877 adult workers, but no minors.

Vice Governor Tri said the measure to protect women and children included working with related agencies, such as the Phuket Social Development and Human Security Office and the Phuket Culture Office.

"We will give warnings to any businesses who violate labor laws. If they don't take action, they need to be closed. As our inspections have revealed, however, there are very few cases involving children in Phuket," he said.

"As for homeless beggars, Thai children and adults will be referred to the public welfare system, to help them get appropriate career training. Foreign beggars will be repatriated," he said.

"Beggars feigning disability is another issue that will be tackled. The Phuket Provincial Office has already asked police to crack down on this, as it is a common source of complaints from tourists," he said.

Tax incentives for new factory, marina growth

HUKET OEM Co plans to build a 76-million-baht surgical-mesh factory in Phuket after receiving a grant of tax incentives from Thailand's Board of Investment (BOI).

Surgical mesh is used to help surgical wounds heal.

BOI senior executive investment adviser Hirunya Suchinai said Phuket OEM Co had successfully turned Swedish research on synthetic fabrics into a commercial project.

Phuket OEM is collaborating with a vocational college in Phuket to devise courses on medical equipment in order to alleviate a shortage of human resources in this field.

The plant will have an annual production capacity of 250,000 pieces.

Meanwhile, the BOI has also granted tax privileges for an 80-million-baht project to expand capacity at the Boat Lagoon.

Presently, 1,000-1,500 boat owners rent boat berths in Phuket for about 60 days at a time, on

pressure on the port's capacity limit," Mr Hirunya said.

This expansion project will provide an additional 80 berths.

About 250 boats berth at the Boat Lagoon, which also offers boat repair facilities.














Friendly frogs hit all the right notes with tourists

AYUTTHAYA: Tourists have been flocking to a temple in the old capitol to get close to a group of extrovert frogs that have taken up residence in a lotus pond.

The frogs sit happily on lotus leaves and allow tourists to stroke and play with them and even pose for photos.

Phrakhrupradit Kijjarak, 46, the abbot of Wat Rachpraditthan in Phra Nakhon Sri Ayutthaya District, said the temple's frog community started out with two baby golden frogs that appeared in the lotus pond around the end of Buddhist lent in October.

As the frogs grew, more and more of the little amphibians came to live in the pool. By the time news of the tame frogs broke on December 22, there were nine of them living in the pool.

Monks began to feed the frogs fish foods. Soon, the frogs became used to the rhythms of temple life and whenever people played music the frogs would come and sit on the edge of the pond to listen and croak along, Phrakhrupradit said. When monks come to feed them, they sit on the lotus leaves to wait for their fish pellets. The abbot added that he thought the colony of frogs had grown in numbers as the frogs felt safe and happy, and so invited their friends to come and live in the temple pond too. Now, it's like the frogs are temple students, Phrakhrupradit said. The day after the story of the frogs was published in the Thai press, around 500 tourists came to pet the animals. Word also seems to have reached Ayutthaya's amphibian community as the following day the chorus of frogs had grown to 12.

Surapha Prachusap, a teacher from Lopburi who brought her students to see the frogs, said they were incredibly tame. Mrs Surapha added that she believes the frogs feel happy and content as Thai temples are known for providing shelter to animals. Phrakhrupradit said if the number of frogs keeps growing, the temple will have to extend the lotus pond so they will all have room to live.

Lotto ruse reels in multiple suspects

BANGKOK: Police arrested 14 suspects, including 10 suspected sex offenders, after sending letters to suspects telling them they had won prizes in a random draw of telephone and national ID card numbers.

Royal Thai Police Region 1, which has its headquarters in Ayudhya, sent letters to around 100 suspects in old criminal cases.

The letters told suspects they had won prizes including and home cinema sets.

The only condition was that they had to come and collect the prizes in person at a shopping center in Bangkok's Chatuchak area on December 24. A total of 12 men and two women fell for the ruse. Ten of the men were wanted on charges of rape and indecent assault.

One of the suspects, 23year-old Yuth Charoensoongnen, was wanted for sexual abuse of

cash, televisions, refrigerators a child under the age of 15 in Nonthaburi. He expressed shock and anger that the police would use such a trick in the name





he worldwide economic meltdown has left many businesses and individuals cash starved and looking for sources of funds. With the banks all but closing their lending windows, and sales of assets at a standstill, there have been few alternatives in locating sources of money. But, in our free market society, if there is a demand for something, a supply will be provided.

In Thailand, the economic slowdown has seen the emergence of *kai fahk*, a practice where the lender will provide a business or individual a loan for a specified period of time.

Not unusual, except that the lender will register this loan at the Land Department and put his name on the borrower's title deed as collateral. If the borrower cannot pay back the loan on time, the lender becomes the legal owner of the property. With a large number of businesses and properties for sale, the lenders and practitioners of *kai fahk* have a wide open and fertile field.

It is reported that some individuals have amassed large land banks through the use of this tactic, and many businesses for sale have reported a large number of *kai fahk* lenders approaching them. In fact, there are more lenders than legitimate buyers, causing many property owners to complain.

It is known that many of the lenders parade as possible buyers to ascertain a property's worth, and to determine the seller's need for cash. For the legitimate sellers of property who are not desperate for cash, this becomes a monumental waste of time, and many property owners will not talk to potential buyers until they have been vetted by their lawyer or property manager.

So until the banks start lending money and legitimate buyers appear, it looks like the *kai fahk* lenders are having a field day ruling the property markets for the small businesses and individuals.

The Dutch East India Company started its influence in Siam and Malaya during the early 17th Century. The company's aim, like many other European traders after them, was to establish a network of trade predominately controlled by the company and secure a Dutch monopoly over the region's resources.

In January 1641, a Dutch expedition captured the city of Malacca, on the western coast of the Malay Peninsula, from the Portuguese, effectively gaining a foothold on which to expand its influence and commercial interests throughout the region.

Tin was the most sought after commodity, which was abundant throughout the Malay Peninsula, Phuket.Island and nearby Phang-Nga.

The abundance of tin in Phuket has played a significant role in the island's history.

In 1642, the Dutch signed trade agreements with the Sultan of Kedah, a Malaya state. In the following years, treaties were also made with the governors of Phuket and Bang-Khli (modern day Phang-Nga).

With these treaties, the Dutch trading company aimed to completely monopolize trade in the region. Ironically they could not stop Malacca, their base city, from continuing to trade freely with its Indian and Indonesian

neighbors, despite continuous attempts to blockade several tin ports in the region.

Malacca had been a thriving port long before Dutch colonialism, and the Dutch quickly realized that the long-established trade ties with Malacca and the rest of Asia were hard to sever.

Instead, they turned their trade ambitions towards other ports in the region. After 1643, the Dutch had set up a trading colony on Phuket in order to control the mining and export of tin resources.

Writings from that period show that early Dutch dealings on Phuket were plagued with frustration. The island had a small population and the locals were heavily exploited. Historical accounts mention that the island was often raided by 'Johorse Saletters', or pirates from nearby Sumatra and Johor.

Every raid culminated in scores of islanders being captured and taken away to be sold as slaves. Many could not bear the harsh life, so fled and resettled elsewhere. In turn, this caused the island's tin mines to be

unproductive, due to the lack of workers.

The arrival of the Dutch trading company on Phuket only made life worse for the islanders.

A 1645 treaty with the governor of Bang-khli and the Dutch East India Company forbade local villagers and merchants to trade with any other foreign vessels calling at Phuket's ports. The penalties for breaking this law ranged from confiscation of merchandise to arrest and slavery.

The governor also promised to make prompt payments to the Dutch company for goods bought, as well as to extend full protection to Dutch trading lodges on Phuket. Also, found in abundance throughout the Malay Peninsula, the island's common laws did not extend to the Dutch.

If a Dutch citizen was accused of murder or rape, for example, he could not be judged by the governor. Instead, the Dutch suspect would be handed over for judgment to a high-ranking officer of the Dutch trading company.

The trade terms were also

seen as strongly in favor of the foreigners. This was because the town governors and Siamese officials had much to gain from trading with the Dutch. Their greed led them to accept treaties that were, at times, extremely disadvantageous to the local population. To Phuket natives, the double standards stirred strong resentment towards the Dutch.

The way the Dutch conducted trade on the island was also reason for local dissatisfaction. In order to profit from the sale of tin mined in Phuket, the Dutch abused their power as the sole buyer of tin on the island.

Unlike nearby ports like Bengal and Tenasserim, where merchants were willing to pay generously for good quality tin, the Dutch only offered half that price to Phuket's tin miners.

The situation eventually boiled over and the locals rebelled against their superiors in an attempt to drive the Dutch out.

They attacked Dutch settlements in the south of Phuket and killed many Dutch citizens, forcing survivors to flee. However, the incident did nothing to persuade the Dutch East India Trading Company to relinquish its trade monopoly on the island. Instead, a Dutch warship blockaded the ports in Phuket and Bang-Khli.

According to Thomas Bowrey, an English trader in the region at the time, the Dutch blockaded the ports of Phuket and Bang-Khli for several years -- until 1675.

The blockading warship was armed with up to 20 cannons. It patrolled the coasts in order to deter merchant ships from docking off at any of the ports.

However, in Bowrey's own words, they utterly failed to accomplish this task. Many vessels could still call at Phuket's ports unnoticed by the Dutch patrol.

In one particular incident, however, a merchant ship from the town of Aceh slipped passed the Dutch blockade and sailed into Phuket, fully loaded with goods. The Dutch seized the ship and all the goods onboard. The Phuket Malays refused to yield to such insolence and tried to retake the Acehnese vessel by force. In the struggle that followed, a Dutch musketeer killed two of the island's ethnic Malays.


When news spread that the Dutch had killed local Malays, the enraged inhabitants vowed vengeance. They mustered about two hundred men and attacked the Dutch.


Outnumbered, the Dutch warship set sail and fled, lifting years of blockade over Phuket.

After the incident, Bowrey concluded that the "Dutch designs over this place were squashed, that they went away with their ship... and never molested Janselone (Phuket) again".

When humans become an endangered species

Atwood's Oryx and Crake throws a political spin on a classic sci-fi concept

ith the death of Robertson Davis a few years ago, my two favorite Canadian novelists are women: Alice Munro and Margaret Atwood.

They are very different. Munro is devoted to the short story, Atwood the hefty novel. She has written no fewer than 20, her most famous being *The Handmaid's Tale* and *The Blind Assassin*, which won the Booker Prize in 2000.

Unlike Munro, who attends mostly to matters of the heart, Atwood isunabashedly political: a lady of the left with passions for feminism and the environment.

Oryx and Crake (Anchor Books, New York, 2004, 376pp) is the first book of her MaddAddam Trilogy.

Like The Handmaid's Tale, this is science fiction, though Atwood prefers the term "speculative fiction": what, given today's trends, will tomorrow look like?

Will religious funda-

mentalism triumph over feminism, as in the *The Handmaid's Tale*? Will the environment run amok, helped along by mad dabbling in genetics?

This is the question tested by Oryx and Crake.

Oryx is a former Southeast Asian child prostitute who has risen to a PhD in education, and is helping Crake, a demented geneticist, in raising a new breed of non-violent, non-racist, vegetarian humans with no notion of sexual violence. The genes of the bonobo, the pygmy chimp, come into play here.


But, as in all the old comic books, something goes horribly awry.

Narrating the story is Snowman, apparently the last of the old human race, who lives in a tree by a beach, wrapped in an old bed sheet, scavenging for food and accepting a weekly cooked fish from the colony of "Crakers".

In time-honored science fiction, catastrophic events are mentioned here casually: the American central plains have turned to dust, the Russian steppes into methane-producing bogs, and the coastal cites of the world have all disappeared under water.

Mutated "wolvogs" and "pigoons" and "ratkunks" roam about in search of prey.

Just like in Orwell's 1984 or Wells' *The Time Machine*, mankind is divided into two: the commoners in decaying violence-

ridden cities, and the elite in sealed-off gated communities with heavily armed guards. In another life, Sandman was Jimmy, the son of a master geneticist.

His mother grows tired of

the whole game of ripping off people for expensive treatments:

"You hype your wares and take all their money and then they run out of cash, and it's no more treatments for them. They can rot as far as you and your pals are concerned.

Don't you remember the way we used to talk, everything we wanted to do?

Making life better for people – not just people with money. You used to be so . . . you had ideals, then."

"Sure," said Jimmy's father in a tired voice. "I've still got them. I just can't afford them."

Jimmy's mother flees to the city to become an underground environmental activist. Jimmy never sees her again.

In college and his first job, he uses the story of his scandalous mother to score women.

"Snowman is ashamed to remember how he's used that story – a hint here, a hesitation there. Soon the women would be consoling him, and he'd roll around in their sympathy, soak in it, massage himself with it. It was a whole spa experience in itself."

Jimmy is rescued from his mediocre education and job by his childhood friend Crake who is at the forefront of genetic research.

In Crake's lair, he finds the great love of his life: Oryx, whom he first saw in a porno video when she was eight.

Crake is also in love with Oryx, who refuses to rise to their level of passion and jealousy, amiably bedding each one.

The global catastrophe, when it comes, is swift, engineered by Crake and unwittingly carried by Oryx around the world. The details are revealed piece by piece by Snowman as he makes his way back to the original lab to replenish his dwindling stock of food, medicine and weapons.

He returns just in time for a cliffhanger climax, which has spurred me to pick up the second volume of the trilogy, *After the Flood*

Margaret Atwood is 70 now and working on the third.

Millions wish her luck.

fter becoming a success in Indonesia with its spacious interior, premium options, proven safety and respectable price tag, Honda has launched the Freed SUV in Thailand.

The new car, built on the same platform as the popular Jazz, features a 1.5 liter engine, delivering a respectable 116bhp (87kW) and 146Nm of torque.

There are various equipment levels, with prices reflecting this, yet virtually all options prove to be excellent value. The Freed is expected to sell for between 894,500 and 1.074m baht.

Although it is a compact SUV, it is a full seven-seater; a widely successful design in its home country of Indonesia. Among the practical benifts of being able to fit seven people, vehicles with seven or more seats in Indonesia are subject to the least amount of vehicle tax.

Given these circumstances, it's not surprising that the Freed, like Proton's Exora, has found its way into being locally produced for Indonesia.

The seven-passenger model features captain's seats in the second row to ensure that occupants are treated to the same level of comfort as if they were in front. The walk-through layout means anyone can get from

front-to-back of the interior very easily, and access any row from any door without having to operate a seat adjuster.

The Freed is also fitted with sliding side doors, either manual or power operated, the latter featuring an 'anti-pinch' device to save trapped fingers.

The instrument panel is placed above the steering wheel to enhance visibility and minimize eye movement. A tilt and telescope steering wheel provides an optimal driving position, while the front A-pillars are designed to maximize visibility. Side window sills descend as they move forward.

Oversized quarter windows give the Freed an unobstructed field of vision.

An eight-passenger version has a 60:40-split, double-folding seats in the second row, creating a bench seat for three. Honda claims to have enough space for a 27-inch wheeled bicycle to fit into the back without having to remove either the wheels, seats or handlebars.

Suspension is conventional with Macpherson struts at perfect front and a rear end locations, while the power steering features electric assistance rather than hydraulic.

The Freed is powered by the well-proven 1.5 liter i-VTEC with a 5-speed automatic. Honda claims it meets the tough Japan emission standards, and also offers reduced fuel consumption compared with its closest competition, such as the Toyota Avanza.

Performance is modest with a claimed 0-100 km/h sprint

in a leisurely 13.2 seconds, while top speed is 170 km/h.

While the Freed has many similarities to the existing Honda Jazz – which is firmly established in the Thai market - it is more comprehensively equipped and has a larger interior. All in all, it's a far better mode of transport. The Jazz, cheap though it is, reflects this difference in the limited scope of its standard features.

Driving the two cars is much the same, with the same nimble handling and agility, but the brakes on the Freed - ventilated discs at the front and drums at the rear – are noticeably better and more progressive. The centrally-located gas tank gives the vehicle a low center of gravity, which helps the handling by making direction changing almost instantaneous.

Safety has been firmly addressed in the Freed, with an advanced body structure that not only helps protect occupants, but also mitigates the damage incurred by other vehicles in the event of an accident.

Pedestrian-injury mitigation technology helps protect other road users from injury in case of collision. To help protect against head injuries during side collisions, a side curtain air bag system is standard on some models and available on all.

Despite the obvious financial reasons for Honda's recent withdrawal from Formula One racing, the company is clearly still investing in production facilities and R&D, hence the introduction of the Freed. It should be a welcome addition to the Thai auto market.

What's in store for investors in 2010?

elcome to 2010, and let's trust that it's a better year than the one just passed.

Before looking at what this year has to offer it is worthwhile reviewing 2009, as much of what happens in the early part of this year will be an extension of trends from the end of last year.

We certainly start 2010 with most areas looking brighter than was the case one year ago.

January 2009 saw markets continue a freefall in what can best be described as panic. The actual meltdown started in the Autumn of 2008 with the collapse of Lehman Brothers, a U.S. investment bank. However, panic on this scale had not been seen since before World War II.

The real cause of this panic may have been attributed to Lehman Brothers and the fact that the U.S. authorities allowed this to happen, but there were many other factors. Banks and related financial institutions had, in countries such as the U.S. and UK, been lending money on a completely unsustainable basis; common sense had apparently disappeared completely.

The former chairman of the U.S. Federal Reserve (central bank), the "Fed", has been widely criticized for keeping interest rates too low for too long after the recession in the early part of the decade. Hindsight shows that this is probably true, but it really was not the cause of the problems that arose.

Many factors contributed to the mess that finally ended in what is now called the "Great Recession".

The real cause was a failure in regulation, and much of the problem can be laid at a series of events and circumstances that made this all go wrong.

The reality is that no sensible lender is going to lend money to a borrower who looks unlikely to be able to repay the loan.

When banks and other lenders become eager to lend money to borrowers who are simply not creditworthy, then something is terribly wrong. Naturally, the old business model of lenders states that if you lend money to those who cannot repay, and if you lend enough to this category of borrower, you will go bankrupt.

However, the rules of the

game changed. Lenders only have to worry about bad loans if they actually hold the loan when it turns sour. The introduction of "securitization" changed everything as it allowed lenders to package their loans and sell them off to an unsuspecting third party, e.g. a municipality or pension fund. When this occurs, then lenders can concentrate on simply finding enough bodies to lend to, be it on credit cards, mortgages, or whatever.

The bonus culture that has in recent years infested the banks simply meant that banks were still incentivized to continue the same behavior.

The reader may well question how this came about, and also

why it had not happened before.

This is where another vital link in the process comes into play – credit rating agencies. It had long been a foundation of the financial system that credit rating agencies gave unbiased views on whatever entity was being examined. From a bank, to a bond, to a country, they all have credit ratings, and the higher the score the lower the risk.

For many years there were only two major credit rating agencies and they effectively became a cartel. The introduction of a new major credit rating agency created competition and the result of this was that any group wanting a better credit rating could go shopping for that rating.

Lenders wanting to securitize a block of loans and sell them to a third party needed to have a good credit rating to make them seem better than they really were. The credit rating agencies were paid for their rating by the lender. The system had been corrupted.

When the securitized loans started to fail, the original lenders found that in most cases they were unable to distance themselves from their own terrible failings. Then the meltdown started.

Banks and other lenders found that they could no longer trust their counter-parties, i.e. other banks, as they often had huge hidden problems in their own balance sheets. The money markets and other markets went into freefall.

2009 started with the continuation of the rout of 2008, in a fashion similar to a virulent disease, the effects of which were felt on a global basis.

The U.S., being at the center of the problem, saw the national currency, the dollar, come under intense pressure. Money flowed to apparently safer areas such as the Yen and the Euro.

Massive stimulus packages introduced into many countries around the world helped stabilize economies and markets.

In March 2009 the realization came that the world was not going to fall into an economic depression. The recovery then started and confidence returned, slowly in many cases.

The recovery was also aided by the realization that governments would simply not allow large financial institutions to collapse. Everybody has learned a lesson from Lehman Brothers.

2010 promises to be a better year than 2009. Some of the global problems have been addressed. The biggest concern for 2010 is the ability of economies to remain on a growth footing without massive government support. During this year, excess liquidity is going to have to be withdrawn without hurting economies. This requires a delicate touch.







Blot on the landscape

As this edition went to press, Chalong Police were questioning a family of French tourists, who were savagely assaulted in Kata [see News pages].

The Gazette has yet to fully confirm all details of the attack, but sources said the beating was thought to have been administered by one tuk-tuk/taxi driver incensed with the fact that the foreigners ignored his command not to park their car along a certain road near Kata Beach.

Although clearly in the public domain, the driver had established that particular stretch of as being under his own private control, the source said. It seems that some miscommunication and cultural misunderstanding were also at work, with the French family speaking little English and perhaps not fully comprehending the danger they were putting themselves in by overriding a directive issued by an alleged member of a Phuket transport syndicate.

At least two of the family reportedly suffered injury requiring hospital treatment, one needing a metal rod implanted in his arm to help his shattered bone heal. It goes without saying that none made it to their intended destination: the beach.

How badly this latest incident will affect the island's already tarnished image among foreign tourists remains to seen. However, the fact is that confrontations between taxi drivers and tourists play out all over the island, year-round. There probably isn't a single car owner on the island - Thai or foreign - who hasn't at some point been told to move out of a 'reserved' area by these groups, whose 'authority' derives solely from the ruthless intimidation tactics they

As horrific as it is, news of the assault will come as little surprise to readers who have been following the Gazette's on-line debate on related Phuket taxi issues. Following a past story, hundreds of letters and complaints poured in to the Gazette from all over the world, many from foreign tourists vowing never to return to the island for this very reason.

It will be interesting to see exactly what line of reasoning the alleged tuk-tuk/taxi driver will take in defending himself: 'Just doing my job', perhaps or 'We are local people and we need to feed our families'. The fact is many drivers, if not most, aren't even registered residents of Phuket.

Chalong Police deserve to be commended if they can bring the guilty party to justice. However, they and other police districts on the island should brace themselves for many similar cases in the future given the sense of thuggery and lawlessness that are allowed prevail in the Phuket public transport sector.



On other occasions, I've requested their help, or just observed officers at work.

Not one single time have I encountered anything but courteous and professional conduct from police officers. And this, I have to admit to my shame, is sometimes in the face of rather annoying and angry behavior on my part.

I wouldn't even be upset if odd financial act of appreciation would be viewed as a perk of their job, but it is a minority viewpoint to think that way.

So hats off to the boys! I hold them in high esteem, and because of their service, I feel much safer here than in my own country.

Confronting human rights: Time to tell all we know

here are three ways to talk about the condition of human rights in any country. The first is to lie through one's the teeth. The second and third options are to tell partial or whole truths.

All these approaches have been used to a certain extent at the universal peer reviews on human rights at the UN Human Rights Council over the past two years. The four-year cycle allows UN members to present and defend their county's human rights records among their peers – or foes.

Obviously, non-democratic countries try every possible way to shield their governments from criticism citing domestic conditions, laws and practices. Further questions from non-democratic regimes are not expected. How can a pot call a kettle black on an international stage?

Comments and questions could be raised from UN members, especially those from countries respecting the fundamental rights of their citizens. Quite often just as visible at the past six sessions, the nondemocratic regimes often questioned and criticized the human rights records of developed countries, highlighting what they claimed as double standards and hypocrisy of the West. For instance, Iran ferociously attacked Norway's racial discrimination at the peer reviews early this month.

Changes in global human rights approaches also impacted on similar policies among major

powers. Recently, US State Secretary Hilary Rodham Clinton spoke in detail about the new direction of US policy on human rights. It was clear that from now on this sensitive issue would be dealt with in more discreet ways, especially when it could be detrimental to other more immediate priorities and cooperation among allies.

Long-term outcomes would be the main aim, not publicity stunts as before. Mrs Clinton was frank in acknowledging the limits of US influence on human rights in countries around the world, especially with the major powers such as Russia or China.

Indeed, even with a small country, such as Burma, US influence is limited.

To remain agile on human rights, Mrs Clinton said the US would work with local democracy groups, multilateral organizations and socially responsible corporations in targeted countries. This strategy would fit in better, especially in the Asian environment.

If the absence of US public criticism could increase overall resources in capacity building in this area, it would be a laudable policy.

The new US human rights agenda, it is hoped, would not affect the annual human rights report put out by the US State Department. Since 1979, assessment of the human rights situation around the world has been used by Congress to evaluate US aid programs to recipient nations. Developing countries would normally lash out at the annual report, labeling it as biased and branding it as an act of interference in internal affairs. Despite its controversial nature, the report has been used as a human rights index by many countries, including Thailand.

In 2007, the first human rights report by the Thai National Human Rights Commission was released with numerous detailed cases of human rights violations the government needs to pay attention to and resolve. Lack of resources, especially a lack of

investigators, has delayed a subsequent report, even though they are supposed to be issued annually.

Within the Southeast Asian region, Thailand is not the only nation trying to improve human rights conditions. Indonesia, Malaysia and the Philippines are also very candid about their human rights records. These four countries, despite existing national human rights commissions, have not done a good job in protecting individual political and civil rights of their peoples. Their work has been marred by bureaucratic inertia and lack of cooperation from concerned authorities on inquiries. In Thailand, investi-gations involving human rights abuses by police or the military were frequently interrupted by lack of follow-up.

When it was set up in 1997, the public viewed the Thai rights commission as a key mechanism to prevent state-sponsored abuses and guarantee a fair administration of justice. It has not been very effective. From 2003 to 2005, for instance, numerous reports of extra-judicial killings wrecked Thailand's reputation as moderate on human rights. Human rights abuses continue unabated in the troubled southern provinces, even though the current government has a pretty good record of respecting human rights in general.

As Thailand is preparing its human rights report for the 12th peer review session at the end of 2011, it has to be straightforward in reporting the whole truth about human rights conditions in the country. In the previous report to the UN Human Rights Commission in 2005, Thai representatives nervously feared the UN would have additional information to rebut their positions, especially on the numbers of deaths resulting from the notorious program of extra-judicial killings of drug suspects

Should the Asean countries

mentioned above manage to ameliorate their human rights records in years to come, they could provide best practice for other members to emulate. As a starter, Indonesia and Thailand set good examples in selecting independent candidates to join the Intergovernmental Commission of Human Rights (AICHR). The commission will have a tough task to protect and promote human rights across the board in the region, due to some members' unyielding attitudes. Asean-based civil society groups are important stakeholders to ensure that AICHR fulfill its objectives.

It would probably take decades of progress for all the Asean members, beyond the 2015 Asean Community deadline, to follow the AICHR terms of reference. After all, an Asean Community without a common approach and commitment to human rights and human dignity is not worth building.

What will the import tax be on my incoming package?

I recently purchased a pair of cross-trainer shoes from a company in China, because I cannot get my size in Thailand. The shoes cost approximately 900 baht plus post and packing.

When I collected the package from the Post Office, I had to pay nearly 700 baht import tax, which seems rather extreme.

Can anyone explain how import tax is calculated?

Customs officer Mr Ratikorn replies:

The import duty for shoes is equal to 30 percent of the item's value. When Customs officers calculate import duty, they also add freight (shipping costs) and seven percent VAT.

Shipping costs from China are quite expensive, making the import tax quite high.

Are bars supposed to stop selling alcohol at midnight?

After reading about the Alcohol Control Act being enforced ['Thailand to raise excise tax on booze', *Gazette* Online, December 24], I have a question.

Some places are not allowed to sell alcohol at all, which is understandable, but the story also says that alcohol can only be sold from 11am to 2pm and from 5pm to midnight. Does that include bars? Can I not go to a bar and have a drink after midnight?

Phuket Public Health officer Ms Meena Panun replies:

By law, bars are included in the act, except those establishments that registered as bars before 2003, before the recent Act was forced. The sale of alcohol in bars is also governed by zoning.

Bars in areas such as Bangla Road in Patong are allowed to sell alcohol until 2am.



Cambodian coastline 'the next Phuket'

lobal property developer CB Richard Ellis announced an 'unprecedented response' from Phuket-based property investors at the launch of a new luxury resort located on an island off the Cambodian coast.

More than 70 people attended the launch of the Song Saa Island Resort Cambodia, which was held at Twin Palms' Catch Beach Club at Surin Beach on December 17.

Organizers said that at least 60 percent of the 14 one- and two-bedroom residential villas were booked during the launch.

Construction of the resort, developed by Brocon Investment Co., will begin next month and is expected to be complete by mid-2011. When complete, it will include a five-star over-water restaurant and bar, swimming pool, spa & wellness center, yoga and meditation center and a beachside water sports center.

Prices for the exclusive villas begin at US\$200,000.

Sugaring the deal for investors was a three-year guaranteed yield of 10 percent and the attraction of the resort project marking the beginning of the international

development of the Cambodian coastline.

"We are extremely pleased with the immediate success we've had in bookings for this project. The Phuket market has clearly identified with the product. Despite being an emerging destination, Song Saa has attracted a global mix of investors, including British, Norwegian, French, Hong Kong Chinese and Hong Kong expatriates," said David Simister, Chairman, CB Richard Ellis Thailand.

"Within one week of sending out the launch invitation, the project has received substantial response and eight bookings were made by the end of the event," he said.

The project offers a 99-year leasehold tenure.

Brocon Investment's chairman Rory Hunter said the launch of Song Saa Island Resort puts Cambodia on the global map and has paved the way for future developments in the area.

"I believe the uniqueness of the product, the charm of the island and pricing have been the key factors for Song Saa's success," he said.

The Song Saa Islands are

nestled in the lee of Koh Rong, Cambodia's most important resort island, pitched to be a future Phuket. The entire island is owned by one of Cambodia's largest corporations, The Royal Group.

According to CB Richard Ellis, a number of international investors have purchased beachfront land in the area and it is expected that the official opening of the Sihanoukville Airport will increase development activity for four- and five-star hotels.

The airport is currently open for chartered flights and private jets. Flights from Phnom Penh and Siem Reap are expected to begin in the near future, with rumors of regional airlines also planning scheduled flights in 2010. The airport will be the principal gateway to Cambodia's southern coast and a critical catalyst for the area's development. Transfer to Song Saa Island is 30 minutes by boat.

"The aim is to position the island as Asia's first environmentally planned island development. With an unparalleled quality of water, beach and the environment, the Koh Rong archipelago and the Cambodian coastline has the potential to become the next Asian Riviera, comparable to established markets such as Phuket, Samui and Bali," said Mr

Central plans Bt200m expansion with expats in mind

entral Festival Phuket is set to undergo a Bt200million transformation in 2010 with retail renovations and the addition of higher-quality shopping, dining and edutainment facilities.

Retail enhancements due by April include an upgrade of the Tops Supermarket to Central Food Hall, similar to the outlet in Central's Bangkok flagship Central Chidlom, which stocks a wide range of international food products from Europe, Australia, Japan and the USA.

According to a CFP spokesperson, Central Festival's 10percent growth in revenue over the past year justified this year's expansion plans.

"Revenue growth in 2009 was less than previous years, which would usually be between 30 and 40 percent. However, last year's growth was still good compared to other retailers," the source said.

"About 40 percent of our customers in Phuket are expats or tourists. They have spending power so we focus on them as a premium class," he said.

As the six-year-old shopping center is well established as a seven-days-a-week banking destination, Central Group directors are now focused on bringing

a wider range of food and dining options to the Phuket mall.

Japanese restaurant Yayoi is among the new dining outlets planned for 2010.

From the Bt200m expansion

budget, Bt20 million has been earmarked for developing the Tops Supermarket, and Bt60 million for general renovation, including the new food hall. The remainder of the budget will go to-

wards retail space expansion and an education zone.

Gymboree, an international child development program center from the US and a Yamaha Thailand Music School

are planned as part of the education zone.

A Central shuttle bus service to the mall from Patong and Phuket Town will also begin operation this year.

Tuk-tuks: the great debate continues

any of us can recall the epic film Taxi Driver with star Robert De Niro playing the demon-ridden Travis Bickle who when asked why he wanted to be a hack, deadpans "Because I can't sleep nights."

When I first moved to the island, I had this uneasy feeling that something wasn't right, that something was missing. It was hard to put my finger on, and after a few days of driving around it came to me in what can only be defined as a true moment of clarity; there were no taxis.

Did they only come out after I was asleep? Or were they in fact there but I just couldn't see them? (My eyesight isn't what it once was.) The only ways to traverse this particular piece of paradise appeared to be car, motorbike or tuk-tuk.

Hate them or put up with them, the tuk-tuk, or, as I like to call them, tuk-tuk-tuk is the locally ubiquitous version of the taxi. Its roots can be traced back to the rickshaw or trishaw that over time became mechanized and morphed into both three- and four- wheel versions.

Now don't get me wrong, I've spent many late nights speeding through the silent streets of Bangkok in a humble three-wheeled tuktuk. I have wonderful memories of urging the obliging wide-eyed driver and new best friend to go faster and faster. But that was a decade ago, and in Bangkok.

This is Phuket, and as the 2009 tourist season is rolling ahead



a 'Great Debate' is again set upon us like a pack of hungry wolves clawing at our collective door.

Some years back a previous governor allowed yellow taxis with meters to hit the mean streets of banana land. And, as most locals remember, all hell broke loose, with vehicles burnt. tires slashed and some reported gunplay.

Since then it's been an uneasy and unholy alliance between metered taxis and the tuk-tuk-tuktuks. From time to time a cautious, slow moving yellow taxi can still be seen, but they appear to be on the endangered species list.

Reading about the recent tuk-tuk wars, blockades, tirades and dismal trashing of all things Phuket, certainly adds a sinister tone to the entire debate about their existence. But what is the true reality of these dark forces that pound the streets?

Although my physique could rightly be compared to a baby water buffalo in expensive running shoes, on most days as the dawn rises I, too, am out pounding the streets; training for triathlons.

Over the years, I've made a friend in a local tuk-tuk driver who also runs, swims and bikes in the same area, and we often trade smiles and wave as we go about out sweaty task.

If I happen to be with a friend as we pass, I often say, "He's a nice guy," before adding, "He drives a tuk tuk." More often then not it creates an immediate recoil. a muttered obscenity or just silence. I can understand the reactions to a certain extent.

However, I believe that in order to improve what is without a doubt one of the biggest negatives for tourists in Phuket, we have to try to understand these business operators and their reality.

Now don't get me wrong; I am in no way justifying the existence of tuk-tuks in Phuket. In fact, it gives me great pleasure to be able to go to Bangkok and get into a metered taxi. I enjoy spending the countless days plying the capital city with the comforting sounds of baht being counted on the noisy contraption.

When you speak to most Phuket tuk-tuk drivers, you learn that their income derives not only from transport but also from commissions derived from delivering customers to restaurants, shops, precious mineral stores....

This system is more or less the same as that employed in most hotels, where staff receive commissions for generating customers. In some industries it's construed as marketing. In others it's considered corruption.

Most Phuket taxi drivers have to pay someone for the daily use of their vehicle, or else make car payments. They have families and children that need to be schooled. If you were to ask a Phuket taxi driver why he does what he does, you'd likely hear, "Because I have to; it's my job."

Personally, as a backseat driver I'd suggest transforming the existing tuk-tuk armada into retrofitted taxis by simply installing meters.

Passengers would then be able to choose a vehicle, sedan taxi or tuk-tuk taxi. With both having meters, what would ultimately happen over time would be the culling of the herd through natural selection.

Now, as taxis in Bangkok receive more and more business, the older tuk-tuks are being gradually grandfathered out. So, unfortunately, the 'late night speeding through the streets of Bangkok in a rickety tuk-tuk' mode of transport in Phuket would also soon be replaced by the less joyous but safer cruising in an airconditioned taxi.


