Tourist and tuk-tuk driver in punch up over 50 baht

PATONG tuk-tuk driver charged with assault for allegedly beating a Canadian tourist has been granted bail.

Tassanarit Damthong, 30, handed himself in at Kathu Police Station hours after the altercation on January 5.

He was arrested and charged with the assault of Canadian tourist Ivan Bob Anwar, 51.

Mr Anwar claimed he was punched five times after refusing to pay 150 baht for a one-minute tuk-tuk ride from the north end of Patong to Kalim at 1pm.

Mr Anwar said he would only pay 100 baht.

Initially denied bail, Mr Tassanarit was released after his wife posted 40,000 baht in surety.

Both Mr Anwar and Mr Tassanarit arrived at Phuket Provincial Court at 1:30pm on January 7 to attend the preliminary hearing.

Mr Tassanarit told reporters that it was Mr Anwar who struck

first. After arriving at the destination in Kalim, opposite the Sunset Beach Resort, Mr Anwar became angry over the fare price and refused to pay, he said.

The Canadian then pointed in his face and kicked him in the chest, the tuk-tuk driver claimed.

Mr Tassanarit lifted his shirt to reveal bruising on his stomach, which he claimed was the result of Mr Anwar kicking him.

After being kicked by Mr Anwar, he retaliated and punched Mr Anwar once in the face, causing him to fall and hit his head on the tuk-tuk, Mr Tassanarit said.

Members of the Patong Tuk-Tuk 'Club' accompanying Mr Tassanarit said they would file counter charges against Mr Anwar.

Mr Anwar told the court that Mr Tassanarit punched him five times after he refused to pay the 150-baht fare.

Kathu Police duty officer Jongserm Preecha said Mr Anwar was brought to Kathu Police Station after the preliminary

hearing and would be charged with assault for kicking the tuktuk driver.

He will not be able to leave Thailand until either the case is cleared or he confesses to the

assault charge and pays a fine.

Mr Anwar was due to leave Phuket at 10am on January 7 for his return trip to Tokyo, but he had to postpone the flight.

Holiday road toll leaves 8 dead, 92 injured

INAL figures are in for this year's 'Seven Days of Danger' road safety campaign in Phuket citing eight dead; almost triple the number from last year, when three died.

The figures, released by the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM-Phuket) on January 5, showed that 82 reported accidents left 92 people with injuries requiring inpatient hospital treatment.

DDPM-Phuket chief Sun Chuntarawong admitted this year's campaign did not meet its objectives, but said there is little authorities can do to affect change in public adherance to and awareness of road safety.

"Change can only come when the people themselves realize the dangers of reckless or drunk driving and speeding. We will continue to promote road safety for the next campaign [Songkran 2010], but will seek more co-operation from the public and invite them to help lay out the strategy together," he said.

The final two victims of the holiday period were a pair of teenagers. Their car crashed into a power pole in rainy conditions about 6pm on January 4 on Thepkrasattri Rd in Mai Khao, home to the infamous 'curve of death' that has claimed the lives of many motorists over the years.

Mr Sun identified the deceased as Wassana Maneesom, 16, and Alongkorn Sirichampa, 17.

Miss Wassana died at the accident scene and Mr Alongkorn was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital, where he later died of his injuries.

The DDPM-Phuket reported that a total of 49,939 cars were inspected at checkpoints during the seven-day period, with 6,503 people arrested or fined. The most common in-

fractions were driving without a license (2,412 cases), riding a motorbike without a helmet (2,037) and failure to wear a seat belt (1,250).

Motorcycles were involved in 82 percent of the accidents, which most commonly occurred between the hours of 8pm and midnight.

Drunk driving was given as the cause of 26 accidents with speeding attributed to another 13 accidents. As in previous years, Muang District had the most carnage: four dead, 55 injured.

Man murdered in nightclub driveby

OLICE are searching for the gunmen who shot and killed a man celebrating the New Year holiday at a Rawai nightclub, in what police believe was a revenge killing by rival gang members.

Chalong Police Investigator Boonlert Onklang identified the deceased as 24-year-old Wanchai Withava, a Chalong resident.

Police received a report of the shooting at the popular Icon Pub, on the road to Kata in Nai Harn, at 4:30am on January 1.

Chalong Police Superintendent Chinnarat Rittakananond and other investigators rushed to the scene, where they found a crowd of Thai and foreign tourists gathered around the body of the victim on the ground in front of the pub.

Mr Wanchai was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital in Phuket Town where he was later pronounced dead.

Police questioned a close friend of the deceased, who said Mr Wanchai was with a group of friends who went to the pub to celebrate the new year.

Mr Wanchai was employed as a gardener at a villa residence in Rawai.

According to the freind, Mr Wanchai was drinking at a table when a man identified only as 'Tor' approached and slapped him twice in the face. After this, about 10 friends of the deceased attacked Tor in retaliation.

Mr Wanchai's party paid their bill and left, the friend told

However, Mr Wanchai later returned with his uncle, hoping to make sure there were no hard feelings on the part of Tor, who has a reputation as a gangster, the friend said.

As Mr Wanchai and his uncle were talking with Tor outside the bar, two Thai males approached them on a motorbike.

The man riding pillion shot Mr Wanchai twice in the head and then the pair sped off.

As this edition went to print, Chalong Police were still investigating the case and had yet to arrest any suspects.

Family New Year beach trip turns to tragedy

TEN-YEAR-OLD boy celebrating New Year's Day with his family at Nai Harn Beach was the first drowning victim of the year in Phuket.

Chalong Police identified the victim as Apichet 'Nong Max' Srinakarak, a student at Wat Thep Nimit School in Wichit.

Police were notified of the drowning at 5pm and rushed to the scene with members of the Phuket Provincial Administrative Organization (PPAO), the Phuket Tourist Rescue Center and workers from the Rawai Disaster Prevention and Mitigation Office.

They were too late to save Nong Max, who left his party of about 25 people and entered the surf with other children at the south end of the beach.

Friends called family members for help after Nong Max went missing.

His body was recovered about 20 minutes later and sent to Vachira Phuket Hospital.

Drowning remains the

number one cause of accidental death among Thai children. Despite being an island, relatively few Phuket children can swim and drownings take place year round.

There were no lifeguards on duty at Nai Harn at the time as a new contractor is currently being

sought to provide the service. The PPAO, which believes the relatively calm surf conditions at this time of year lowers the risk of drowning, announced that a new contract for lifeguards will be put out for tender this month.

Karon tuk-tuk driver hands himself in to police, gets bail

accused of attacking a family of French tourists with a meter-long pole on December 26 turned himself in to police and was released on bail, the Gazette has learned.

Chalong Police Inspector Chana Suthimas identified the alleged attacker as 32-year-old Likhit Thaengthae, a resident of Karon.

Mr Likhit appeared at Chalong Police Station at 10am on January 4 and posted bail. Assault charges against him will be filed with the Phuket Criminal Court soon, Lt Chana said.

> The family's children – aged one, seven and nine - were present at the time of the attack.

> Witnesses said Mr Likhit became enraged when the family parked their rented car in a public parking lot near the Karon Municipality offices in Kata.

> The tourists, on their way to the beach at the time, ignored his command to park elsewhere because they could not see any signs indicating the lot was reserved for tuk-tuks or taxis, which Mr Likhit insisted it was.

Morning market mayhem: runaway car sends bikes, shoppers and fruit flying

N out-of-control car plowed through market stalls in the Samkong area of Phuket Town on January 3, leaving scores of motorbikes damaged and one woman with a broken arm.

Phuket City Police were informed of the accident at 9am.

Arriving at the scene on Hongyok U-Thit Rd, they found 10 damaged motorbikes, including a Honda Wave smashed beyond repair.

A crowd of shocked onlookers surveyed the damage, which included a crashed Hyundai sedan that was later revealed to be an official vehicle of Vachira Phuket Hospital director Dr Jessada Chungpaibulpatana.

Adding to the mayhem were fruit and vegetables scattered all over the road, from stores that are normally at

their busiest at that time of day.

Injured in the crash was 53-year-old Oronong Suriyawong, who was taken to hospital for treatment of a broken arm and other injuries.

About 20 meters away in the middle of the road was the car that caused the mayhem with a damaged windshield, radiator and hood that was still covered with fruit and vegetable matter.

The driver, 37-year-old Sutheep Rungruen, did not try to flee the scene.

She told investigators that before the crash she had visited relatives in the area.

After starting the engine, the car accelerated quickly, plowing through everything in its path.

Police think that panic and problems with her footwear getting stuck beneath the brake pedal may have been the cause.

Stairs still an obstacle for disabled CCTV workers

HUKET City Police are moving forward with a plan to have disabled people monitor closedcircuit television (CCTV) security cameras, but the project will be limited to those who can get up the stairs to the fourthstorey CCTV control room on their own.

Phuket City Superintendent Wanchai Ekpornpit told the Gazette on January 5 that his department is working with the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO) to screen applicants to monitor existing CCTV cameras, as well as 53 more units funded by the PPAO expected to be operational by the end of the month.

Plans to use teams of nine disabled people at a time, working in shifts to monitor the screens, were announced in early November. However many members of the Phuket Disabled Peoples' Club who would like to take part are wheelchair-bound or otherwise unable to get up the stairs.

no budget to install an elevator, Col Wanchai said his department is working with the PPAO and Don't Drive Drunk Foundation to find volunteers capable of getting up the stairs on their own.

Phuket Disabled Peoples' Club President Sawai Promjinda said his group had yet to receive any detailed information about the project, however.

"I think it is still in the public relations phase," he said.

Although the project will begin in Phuket City, the PPAO As Phuket City Police have would eventually like to expand


CCTV coverage across the island and have disabled volunteers working in each police precinct. Chalong Police District has been mentioned as the next target area.

Col Grissak Songmoonnark, Superintendent of the Kathu Police, which has jurisdiction over Patong, told the Gazette earlier that volunteers would need considerable training in how to use the technology. This includes camera zooming and tracking of suspects to ensure high-quality images are obtained.

Phuket gets Bt10 billion for infrastructure improvements

proved a 2010 budget that includes ten billion baht (approx US\$295 million) in funding for Phuket under the Finance Ministry's 'Thai Khem Khaeng' (Strong Thailand) stimulus package.

The new budget green lights projects intended to solidify Phuket's position as one of Southeast Asia's leading tourist destinations.

Highlights of the plan include a major airport expansion, improvements to roads and transport infrastructure, new schools and construction of an international convention and exhibition center.

Plans for a world-class convention center on the island have come and gone for almost two decades, with numerous sites considered and plans unveiled.

Under the latest plan, the center is to be built on Treasury Department land in Mai Khao, near the Sarasin Bridge.

The lion's share of the newly approved budget, 5.8

an expansion of Phuket International Airport, which will increase transit capacity from 6.5 million to about 12.5 million passengers annually.

An additional 2.8 billion baht is earmarked for the convention and exhibition center. which will be built without a hotel and some other facilities that were included in the original proposal.

Phuket MP Raywat Areerob of the Democrat Party said that Mai Khao and Thalang in general stood to benefit in many ways from the convention center, including an improved road network with overpasses.

The Mai Khao location will also make the center more easily accessible to people driving in from Phang Nga and Krabi, he said.

Some have criticized the location as being too remote from the island's main population centers to be practical.

Other projects approved under the plan include 100

HE Cabinet has ap- billion baht, is slated for million baht for a new indoor stadium at Saphan Hin, 400 million baht for an overpass or tunnel at the Darasamuth School Intersection on the bypass road, and approximately 90 million baht for infrastructure improvements, including paving of dirt roads.

Mr Raywat said the funds should be available after the end of January.

Structural work on the convention center should take two or three years, he said.

The Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process for the airport expansion work was completed earlier this year, but plans still need to be drawn up and finalized before it can go out to tender, he said.


The Darasamuth School Intersection flyover (or tunnel) would be the most labor intensive of the smaller projects.

Still in the very early stages of its extensive EIA preparation, it could take up to five years to complete, he said.

Kamala snatch-and-run bandits face their victims

PAIR of of English tourists flew out of Phuket on January 6 with no pictures of their holiday to show friends back home – thanks to the depredations of a trio of thieves in Kamala.

Englishwoman Alyson Ashforth, 30, and her companion Nicholas Gilmore were walking back to their room at the Aquamarine Resort & Villa at about 10:30pm on January 3 when the thieves struck in front of Rajaprajanukroh 36 School on the beach road.

Ms Ashforth filed a complaint with the Kamala Police, and said that three men approached from behind on a motorbike, snatched her handbag and sped off.

The bag contained a Sony

Realizing the trio didn't pick up any cash in the heist, Kamala Police officers expected them to remain on the prowl.

cosmetics, she told police.

As, according to the police, snatch-and-run crimes are uncommon in the area, the Kamala officers co-ordinated with neighboring Cherng Talay Police in searching for the culprits. The effort paid off: two of the three suspects were taken into custody on Srisoonthorn Rd Soi 11 in Cherng Talay about half an hour after the complaint was reported.

The pair were identified as Jirawat Salee and Manoon Manabutr, both 18 years old.

The two have been charged with conspiring to commit a snatch-and-run theft using a

vehicle, charges which could land them in prison for up to seven years and six months. The third suspect remains at large.

On January 5, Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Thantipong and Kamala Police held a press conference to announce the arrest of two men. The press conference included a re-enactment of the crime.

"We want to know for sure, before we go back, that those guys are going to jail, because they deserve it," Ms Ashforth said at the re-enactment.

With their camera returned to them, all its photos deleted, Alyson and Nicholas returned to England after a 14-day holiday in Phuket.

"One thing we don't understand is why they had to view and delete all the photos in our camera. Those photos really meant a lot to us," she said.

"Phuket is not a bad place to go on holiday at all. Even though we had a bad experience our first time here, we will be coming back again," she added.


euro and one US dollar in cash.

Corruption busting councillor shot dead

CHUMPHON: A member of came and Mr Pocharaphon's Lamae Municipality was shot dead following a New Year's party in the early hours of January 2.

Police believe the killing was motivated by the victim's dedication to anti-corruption campaigns against certain town council members.

Pocharaphon Sae-cheuang, known locally as 'Sor Thor Dong', was found dead in a patch of grass by the roadside near his home.

A witness reported seeing Mr Pocharaphon, 42, stop to relieve himself on the way home from the party, which was held at a nearby municipal market.

As he was standing, two men on a motorcycle pulled up behind him. The pillion passenger called out his name and shot him once in the forehead when he turned around. Mr Pocharaphon died at the scene.

The witness said they reported the shooting to the police at around 1am, but no officers

body was not found until about 8am in the morning.

At the time of his death, Mr Pocharaphon was serving his second term as a member of Tambon Lamae Municipality.

He had developed a reputation for honesty and exposing corruption.

The day before his death, he received an anonymous phone call warning him to stop digging up evidence of corruption.

An officer investigating the killing said police believe the motive may have been Mr Pocharaphon's exposure of corruption in the tenders of 10-million-baht building project that caused an influential figure to lose out.

Police believe the gunmen came from 'Sum Surat', an association of gunmen for hire run by local politicians in neighboring Surat Thani province, the officer said.

Four-year-old shoots himself and family member


NARATHIWAT: A four-year-old boy shot himself and a relative while playing with his father's gun on January 3.

How safe is that tour boat?



Tonce took a water taxi in Sydney for a short hop around the corner from Darling Harbour. The boat remained within swimming distance of the shore and was crammed full of lifesaving equipment.

At the time I wondered how Phuket's tour boat fleet would fare if Aussie maritime safety rules were applied.

Visitors to Thailand only need the taxi ride from airport to learn that local attitudes towards safety are somewhat different from their home country's standards. Few farangs realize that these sub-par safety

practices are standard aboard the dive and tour boats they entrust their lives to.

Most western countries have detailed safety rules for commercial passenger vessels. One example is the UK Maritime &

Coastguard Agency's Small Commercial Vessel Code or SCV Code.

Any tour boat operating in the UK has to conform to the safety standards set forth in this code and is surveyed annually. Failure to comply with SCV Code means the boat cannot leave port.

Based on the SCV Code, here are some questions you should ask the boat operator before you book your diving cruise, fishing trip or islandhopping tour. Their reply will tell you a lot about the type of ship they run.

In recent years, there have been several accidents with tour boats capsizing, catching fire and sinking. Lives have been lost. The object today is to give you, the reader, a few tips that help determine if your tour boat is safe before boarding.

The basic safety questions should include the following:

Is there a liferaft on board? What is the boat's capacity?

Are there life buoys or life rings and enough of them?

How many emergency flotation devices are there and are any of them fitted with lights?

Are there enough lifejackets for everyone, including children?
Are there effective means

to recover a person from the water?


Does the vessel carry flares and smoke signals?


When is the boat due for inspection?

Some boat operators will tell you they don't need liferafts on board.

That is an incorrect and dangerous assumption. Inflatable dinghies and liferafts are not the same thing. The biggest difference is that dinghies are not stocked with emergency water, food and medicine.

If a boat is indeed operating very close to shore and there are no liferafts provided, then ask the operator about their emergency plan concerning abandoning the vessel at sea.





Boats practicing good safety measures will display safety plan diagrams. There is a common tendency for vacationing tourists to disregard the need for safety aboard the ever-popular tour boats. With little effort, any passenger can assess the basics of boat safety.

Before you board, check to see if the vessel is loaded deeper than the waterline or listing to one side

If the vessel looks unstable and unseaworthy, then she probably is.

Watch out for continuous pumping of the bilge, as evidenced by a non-stop flow of dirty oily water, which also not a good sign.

Ask to see proof of competence of the key people on board. Keep in mind that aboard every vessel there should always be someone else besides the captain who is capable of navigating the vessel.

A good boat operator should be able to show a Load Line Certificate, a recent survey of his vessel and proof of liability insurance, as required by Thai law.

If the above questions were

answered to your satisfaction and you have booked the trip, there are still some additional things you should look for once aboard the boat.

All of the life saving equipment should be in plain sight and easy to deploy. The boat should have a sturdy side rail or gunwales.

Look for any unsecured heavy items on deck; they can become a problem in rough seas.

Persistent fuel smells, especially on boats powered by outboard engines, are a bad omen. Sneak a peek in the galley – if the cooking gas cylinder is stored near the stove, or anywhere else indoors, you know you are on an unsafe boat.

Next, have a look at the doors, windows and hatches.

Many locally built tour boats are prone to downflooding. This is what happens when a large wave washes over the deck and water gets below through doors and hatches that are not watertight. The amount of water that enters in downflooding is often enough to overwhelm a vessel's bilge pumping capacity.

Lastly, look around the interior. You want to see a tidy, uncluttered ship with plenty of portable fire extinguishers in sight. Smoke or fire alarms should be fitted and clearly displayed.

All "EXIT" signs and the boat's deck plan should be in a prominent place and easy to see. Any lifejacket storage should be clearly identified.

These safety checks are a lot to ask from a person on vacation, but keep in mind we haven't even talked about machinery and systems that are impossible for the average passenger to check.

Until the authorities and boat operators get more serious about real safety for commercial tour boats, then asking questions and keeping your eyes open is all that stands between you and a disastrous boat trip.

- 4. Relax and breathe slowly in and out. Thank the sun and slowly open your eyes. Continue your adventure.


Benefits: Standing or sitting quietly is a perfect preparation for a yoga session. It develops awareness, imagination and concentration.

Benefits: This posture opens the chest, makes the back strong and strengthens the diaphragm so breathing can flow easier...



Philippe Zircon

Philippe Zircon first arrived in Phuket from Paris in 1981, on ing handicrafts and jewelry in Bali and then selling them in Ibiza, an invitation from a French friend who gave no local address. The 20-year-old Philippe didn't know that Phuket was a big island with lots of people. But the enterprising young man found his friend anyway, on the second day of his visit to Phuket, at Kata Beach.

He grew up in the Drome region of France on his mother's family farm that was full of peach and apricot trees. His father was a mechanical engineer from the West Indies. The young Philippe decided to leave home at age 14 to begin his life in Paris.

"I had always been intrigued by the idea of travel to faraway places. As a child, I remembered the scent of the perfume Fiji, and I decided that I wanted to go to the place with that name. So I spent my teenage years buying and selling clothes, working in a laundry and collecting and selling scrap metal. By the time I was 20, I had saved enough money to be able to travel to the other side of the world."

During his first year on Phuket, Philippe learned to dive off the waters of Koh Racha. He also became friends with a British expat who wanted to refurbish a traditional Chinese junk. After spending the next year buyBombay and Goa, Philippe returned to Phuket in 1983 to join as a partner to refurbish the junk at Ao Makkham. With his new partner, they opened Ocean Center Tours in Phuket Town.

"We were fortunate to capture the interest of Mom Tri Devakul and his partner, Gerard du Deffend, who were developing the Le Meridien resort and wanted our junk to carry guests on day trips off the coast.'

With solid financial backing, Philippe was able to contract the work to put their junk into operation offering sunset cruises and journeys to Phuket's remote, deserted beaches.

In 1989, Philippe opened his own boutique, 'Dam Dam', in Phuket Town in a traditional Sino-Portuguese house where he sold clothing and handicrafts from Indonesia and India.

By 1993, he was ready to return to life on the Andaman Sea and became a guide aboard, and then manager of base operations for, the June Bahtra, a traditional wooden sailing junk operated by East West Siam.

In 1998, he joined Thai Marine Leisure, the region's most experienced yacht managers. The company also offered brokerage, chartering, and insurance services. Over the next ten years, Philippe was a Director, shareholder and General Manager of the company.

Life was moving along quite smoothly for Philippe until one day he began to notice unusual pain in his neck and arms.

"I went to three Phuket hospitals who all told me not to worry about it. Eventually, I flew to Bangkok where x-rays showed I had tumors in my head, causing the pain.


"I was hospitalized for months. At times, I couldn't even breathe or walk without a lot of effort. But eventually I was well enough to fly home to France for a series of medications that gave me back my life."

These days, Philippe works to improve his health through exercise and detox therapy. He traveled extensively last year to Bali, Goa, Sri Lanka, Switzerland and France and spent a month in Chumporn province improving his skills in kite surfing.

He has also set up his own company, Generale Marine Asia, which manages boat trips on the Mekong.

"I'm also interested in developing a new type of boat trip for Phang Nga Bay and I'm curious to develop new systems for boats to be more efficient in the amount of power they use."

Philippe has a charming enthusiasm about his life on Phuket and all the travels, adventures and new friends that are waiting for him to discover. - Bruce Stanley

La dolcé ristoranté

On the **men**

ome well-known and successful restaurants in Phuket are meant to be; the result of serendipitous circumstances. Others achieve recognition through acquired talent, pure graft and long hours. And there are some that are so heavily financed they are willing to operate at a loss, just to save face.

The first two certainly apply to M&M's in Nai Harn and I believe the best way to describe this place is to quote the Australian entrepreneur Alan Bond, who said, "The harder I worked, the luckier I got."

It's very rare that I rave about a place that has created its very own niche, quite simply because there aren't many on the island. After all, there are loads of restaurants that flaunt firstrate chefs, so some degree of success would seem logical given the mixture of a still relatively good international money exchange, along with top-of-therange locations and flown-in culinary talent.

When you take all those factors into account, it'd almost be a tragedy for them not to succeed to some measure.

M&M's is Phuket's wonderkind, a one-off. Wellloved by local expats, a must-do for tourists and highly recommended by food guides, this unpretentious yet highly frequented Italian eatery has got to be at the top of my list for the past year's Gazette reviews.

Maggie, from Brescia, is a vivacious, charming and down-toearth hostess, who has a great team of savvy staff members. Mario is from Sondrio, also in northern Italy, and he's the silent guy busting a gut in the show kitchen.

the cogs of this open-sided



Amid the sounds of blues music, a bustling kitchen and warm chatter, M&M's restaurant serves up traditional Italian fare. Having recently relocated to Nai Harn, M&M continues to be an island favorite.

spaghetteria and pizzeria, while Mario creates the popular dishes.

With low prices, great food and a genuine Italian atmosphere, for nine years it reigned supreme amongst Rawai's beachside eateries; now it has moved up the road to face the Nai Harn challenge.

And what a challenge it is. Did you know that the stretch of road from Nai Harn Beach to Don's Mall contains no less than 50 restaurants, all vying for customers through a troupe of gimmicks? Some are amateurish, as one sign announces 'Drauhgt Chang Beer 30 Bath' and some are pretty slick. However, M&M's alone regularly brings in Italian is one of the world's most beautiful spoken languages, he merely shrugged and asked, "Why do they speak with their hands so much, then?"

We opt for a rucola salad with cherry tomatoes and Parmesan cheese, plus a troika of thin-crust pizzas and spankingfresh gnocchi, washed down with a carafe of red house wine.

The pesto pizza comes out of the oven and the customer announces his pane e crudo to be the best pizza he's had in his 14year Phuket sojourn.

For an old crusty like me, the pizza crust is a welcome respite from the spongy, ketchup and prawn Thai versions available locations at Central Festival.





The place fills up with a Friday-evening crowd and the tempo of service sharpens; Mario ups the pace, too.

With steelworker-like precision, he shoves in and removes pizzas from the oven, while peals of laughter ring through the early evening air as Maggie makes the rounds.


Meanwhile we sit, contentedly digesting one of the most down-home meals we've had for ages.



he world of investment is a baffling one and the list of options is growing all the time. The following descriptions will give you some indication of the categories available in the collective investment world.

Money Market Funds are investments on cash or short-term money market securities. The advantage for investors is that they get, because of the large amounts invested in total, whole-sale investment rates which would not normally be available to investors.

There are many 'funds' to choose from in a wide variety of currencies. In the Anglo-Saxon investment world, customers often ask banks or financial institutions for rates on fixed-term

deposits, but in countries such as France, the public would be more inclined to ask the current yield on a money market fund.

Banks usually offer two

types of money market funds: up to six months; from six to 18 months. They can be withdrawn without notice and interest accrues daily.

Bond Funds come in many shapes and sizes. Collectively, they cover trillions of dollars, euros and other currencies, but the bond products are usually more complicated than they superficially appear.

For their bonds, funds either invest in a wide range of currencies or one currency in particular. Every fund has a 'base' currency, but will use the issues of other currencies to enhance the returns.

Currency hedging techniques may or may not be employed so investors should examine the investment strategy in advance.

High Yield Bonds are the attempts by a fund manager to enhance returns by investing in bonds with a low-grade investment rating – or even in bonds that are not of investment grade.

One recent case involved a very large investment group that offered short-dated bonds to investors, giving them the same feeling of safety as would be expected in a money market fund.

Unfortunately, the fund included some SIVs (Structured Investment Vehicles) and investors only received 96% of their capital back. Fortunately, no members of the public were involved. However, 14 institutional investors were affected.

The fund was shut down immediately afterwards.

This was a very unusual case as the fund manager is one of the largest corporations in the world. The fund was not large so the losses only amounted to US\$10-15 million.

For the sake of their reputation, perhaps it would have been wiser for them to have taken the loss on their balance sheet.

Asset Backed Lending is an area where the primary question is 'what are the quality of the assets?'.

Even sophisticated institutional investors have to be careful and wary of credit-rating announcements. Security listings have been given a 'double-A' and even 'triple-A' credit rating only to be downgraded to worthless 'junk' a few months later.

Simply put, those with global-credit-rating awareness were caught completely off guard by a wave of SIVs, Collateralized Debt Obligation and other complex 'paper'.

The credit rating agencies claim that it's the investors who are ultimately responsible for their individual assessments. It's only a matter of time before many of these cases end up in court, especially in the US.

This has been a serious blow to credit rating agencies' credibility. It will take them years to recover. For example, it used to be standard operating practice for Swiss Bank to offer clients a selection of bonds, with the credit

rating included as standard information. Many other global banks find themselves in exactly the same situation.

Structured Products have frequently been foisted on to an unsuspecting public by many of the world's private banking operations.

They advertise in the most exclusive magazines and financial publications alongside six-figure watches, eight-figure real estate and the finest products and services for the ultra rich and often hint that they really don't serve 'riff raff' clients with less than US\$10 million.

Some of the products they sell are of the 'heads-we-win, tails-you-lose' variety. Just as the 'sub prime' borrowers in the US housing market are screaming that they did not understand the contract, rich victims of private banking operations also did not understand the nature of their investments.

However, they are generally too embarrassed to discuss these matters. The simple remedy is, if you do not understand a financial product, LEAVE IT ALONE.

You will not be alone in your decision to do so.

Many high-flying or crashing investment bankers have learned that opaque financial products are to be avoided.

The new term in global financial circles is 'transparency'. It is only common sense, but how many million of investors keep forgetting that point?

We only have to look back to 1999, when Warren Buffett – the world's wealthiest investor – said he did not understand the business model or valuations of many dot.com start-ups.

Bloomberg LP founder, Mi-chael Bloomberg, also stated in an interview in the late 1990s that many dot.com companies did not have viable business plans and had never even shown profits.

How many people were listening then?





CCTV a logical move

The Phuket Provincial Administration Organization's (PPAO's) funding of 53 more closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras at a cost of 17 million baht seems a wise use of taxpayer money, which should provide a needed boost in security, albeit initially just to Phuket Town residents.

Numbers alone justify the increased use of ever-improving CCTV technologies in the war against crime. Phuket has a regular police force of about 1,200 officers to provide security for an actual population estimated to exceed one million during peak periods.

Although difficult to estimate, the police-to-population ratio could exceed 1:1,000 during the high season. Such a figure might be appropriate to a Utopian society, but that description hardly fits a tourist destination like Phuket, as best evidenced by the recent series of violent confrontations between tourists and locals.

Indeed, Phuket's cosmopolitan make-up, huge migrant population and drastic disparities between haves and have-nots conspire to make crime practically unavoidable. Given that the Royal Thai Police has no stated plans to increase the number of officers here, using CCTV and other effective crime-fighting technologies seems the most

This editorial writer may be in the minority when it comes to CCTV coverage, however, preliminary results of a Gazette reader's poll on whether the CCTV expansion will make much of a difference reflect widespread pessimism in all three demographics: Thais, expats and tourists.

With 163 votes in, the number of people who felt increased CCTV coverage wouldn't make any difference (30.1%) more than doubled the number of people who felt it would (12.9%).

The majority of voters, however, felt that the CCTV expansion should have started in Patong and Karon, especially where tuk-tuk drivers congregate.

This yet again reflects a widely held belief among readers that the island's firmly-entrenched transport syndicates – and the forces that ensure their continued existence – are the biggest hindrance to the island's tourism industry and the rule of law and order.

As with any security system, the effectiveness of the CCTV surveillance is only as good as the people behind the monitors.

Given the extent to which law enforcement manpower is spread thin, the joint plan by the PPAO and Phuket City Police to use disabled people to work in this capacity makes perfect sense and should truly be a win-win situation.

Unfortunately, lack of access to the Phuket City Police Station's fourth floor CCTV control center by disabled people who rely on wheelchairs prevents the project from helping those who would benefit from it the most.

A memoir of Phuket justice



Phuket Provincial Court Chief Varangkana Sucharitakul is a well-known proponent of mediating disputes outside the court system in efforts to ease court case loads and save taxpayers' money. A mother of two, Mrs Varangkana has 18 years' experience in the Thai judicial system, including several posts in the juvenile court system and as

chief court justice in Phattalung and Ubon Ratchathani provinces. Judge Varangkana recently learned she will be transferred to the Region 8 Court of Appeals in Bangkok, effective in April. Before leaving the island, she wanted to say goodbye and share some of her experiences and insights with *Gazette* readers.

I think the juvenile court system is more complicated than the normal court, because the primary objective is not to punish, but to teach and rehabilitate. But whatever the court, the qualities needed to be a successful judge are the same: good communication skills, patience, respect for the law and an ability to observe the social constraints that come with the position.

Phuket Provincial Court is quite different from most others, because many cases involve foreigners, with consular representatives and other embassy staff always coming to check on the progress of cases. Some of them don't quite understand the system and complain that the cases are being tried too slowly. They want the cases to move though the system faster, but we must treat all cases the same way as we do those involving Thai people. Consider that if a Thai national breaks the law in another country, that person is treated equally under the law of that country.

Nevertheless, some consular officers have asked to modify the system by setting up a special court for cases involving foreigners. Even if we wanted to, we couldn't do that Phuket, as it would require a policy change from the Court Justice Bureau. However, in petty cases such as the theft of the beer mat in Patong last year, we can expedite the process by allowing them bail right away so they can return home. But each case needs to be considered independently, on its own merits. In the case of foreigners in jail, I try to schedule their hearings as quickly as possible.

The court system is the final support system for the public, and I can honestly

say in my capacity as a Chief Justice that the courts are unbiased and fair. People must behave themselves while inside the courthouse and neither the media nor any other observers are allowed to comment on court rulings.

If any litigants does not agree with a court ruling they can enter an appeal.

Unfortunately, this isn't always what happens. After one memorable case at Ubon Ratchatani Court, a fight broke out between litigants unhappy with the verdict. One girl took off her high-heel to hit another. They were both jailed immediately.

Another famous case here in Phuket involved Taiwanese gang members living in Phuket and other places throughout Thailand, where they set up bases with the intent of defrauding fellow countrymen. They were denied bail and many questioned this move, saying it was just a small case. But our reputation would have been tarnished if we let them out on bail.

With just eighteen judges and 10,000 cases a year, the court is very busy, so the mediation center helps a lot. The mediation project nationwide was initiated by the Dispute Settlement Office of the Court Justice Bureau. The mediation process is divided into criminal and civil cases. Some types of criminal cases can be mediated outside the court, such as those involving fraud or embezzlement. Most civil cases can be mediated. The only exceptions are single party cases, such as when an heir or heiress applies for an inheritance and there are no disputes to the claim.

Last year, Phuket Provincial Court won three awards, including two for excellence in mediating cases outside the court system. For all of 2009, we settled 90.6 percent of civil cases and 72.3 percent of criminal cases entered into the mediation system.

If the Chief Justice emphasizes the importance of mediation, the process will work well. Last year when I was Chief Justice in Ubon Ratchathani, the court also won first prize for its success in mediation.

One case I am particularly proud to have successfully mediated was an inheritance dispute between two brothers whose parent died intestate. The case dated back 15 years and had already been ruled upon by the Supreme Court, which sent its ruling in the form of an official court letter that I received unopened. I was about to open it, but when I reviewed the case and realized they were brothers I wanted to try one last time to get them to settle. So I set up a meeting, showed them both the letter and asked how either of them would feel if they received nothing from the ruling. I also asked them to think about how their parents would have felt about the case if they were still alive. Finally they agreed to share the inheritance, so I sent the ruling letter back to the Supreme Court unopened. To this day we still don't know what judgment it contained.

Phuket's rapid economic development has made land prices here very expensive and many land disputes end up at Phuket Court, including those involving encroachment. Some of these are not possible to mediate, such as cases of encroachment on public land.

In April, I will take up my new position as Deputy Chief Justice of the Region 8 Appeals Court in Bangkok, where

I will continue to stress the importance of mediation. With the right leadership, the process can work well.

As an example, I recently mediated a case between Phuket Provincial Organization President Paiboon Upatising and another litigant. I spoke to them both for five minutes each over the phone and they agreed to a settlement. Think about this when taking a case to court. It is a long and expensive process, so mediation is the best way. It can also settle disputes that might otherwise turn violent.

I think the mediation center here in Phuket will continue to function well, even after I am gone, as we have laid a very good foundation with 30 experienced mediators. In civil cases not all mediators have to be judges. For example, one civil mediator here in Phuket is an election commission officer from Phang Nga. I would like to thank them as they have to work very hard for little compensation, just 500 baht per settlement. How long each settlement takes to negotiate depends on the litigants. In some cases they have to go back and forth up to seven times before a settlement can be reached.

I would like both Thais and foreigners who have questions about cases to speak with us at the mediation center.

My goal in life is simply to do the best I can day to day. I have gained a great deal of experience in Phuket and I will miss this beautiful island and its kind residents. I have been impressed with all of the government department heads, especially the governor, police commander, head of the legal execution department and the prison warden.

Are tourists allowed to share taxis from the airport?

Miss Piyanan of the Taxi Meter Association replies:

A taxi meter is provided for one-stop service only. If you would like to be dropped off at different destinations, you will pay separate fares.

For example, if you hire a taxi and would like to be dropped off at Kamala beach, but your friend wants to be dropped off at Patong beach, the prices will be different. You can expect to pay a 300 baht fare to Kamala and your friend should expect to pay 450 baht fare for Patong. That means you and your friends have to pay a total of 750 baht.

Should I be charged for parking in Phuket Town?

Yes, it is legal. There are signs in Thai and English saying a parking fee will be collected around Phuket town.

The price for a motorcycle is 1 baht for the first hour and two baht for every additional hour.

The price for a three-wheeled vehicles is three baht for the first hour and five baht for every additional hour.

The price for a car is five baht for the first hour and 10 baht for every additional hour.

Course set for 'fun' regatta Tournament courts



The Phang Nga Bay Regatta will be held February 3 - 7, emphasizing its trademark theme of having fun. Sailors will spend four days racing through the bay's scenic limestone karsts.

The Phang Nga Bay Regatta 2010, one of the world's most scenic sailing events, will be the center for the Southeast Asia's yachting community this February 3 - 7.

Encompassing four days of racing and five days of partying that covers the three provinces of Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi, the regatta's success in past years has helped it earn the nickname, 'the fun regatta'.

Now in its 13th year, this year's regatta 2010 is expected to be the biggest yet. With over 60 yachts participating, the regatta has established itself as one of the key fixtures on the South East Asia yachting calendar.

Entries from Thailand, Malaysia, Malta, Singapore, France, Australia, New Zealand and the United Kingdom will compete for honors in six classes: Racing, Cruising A, Cruising B, Bareboat Charter, Firefly 850 and Multihull.

The racing committee endeavors to pursue the fun-loving credence throughout the race.

The Regatta is organized by the PNBR 2010 Organizing Committee under the auspices of the Ao Chalong Yacht Club. The courses are set by local Phuket sailing personalities Andy Dowden and Simon James.

As a media sponsor of the event, the *Phuket Gazette* will be providing comprehensive coverage of the action.

Boat registration and the opening party will be held at Absolute Chandara Resort and Spa at Ao Por on Wednesday, February 3.

The following day, the racing day begins from the north east corner of Phuket and races north to the top of Phang Nga Bay, past the famous ramparts of Koh Phansak, the Koh Hong Islands and James Bond Island, ending



Locals take grass roots action against rapid development

fter a fourteen year battle with mounting trash, the Koh Racha Yai Environmental and Conservation Protection Association have finally found an answer to the island's environmental plight: their very own recycling plant.

The association, which was established in 1996 by a few conservation-minded locals, today boasts 490 members each donating between one and 20,000 baht in membership fees to join.

Since its inception, the association has tried to find methods to conserve Koh Racha Yai's land and marine ecosystems.

Koh Racha Yai is located about 20 kilometers south of Phuket's main island.

The island's pristine waters in Ao Patok, Ao Siam, Ao Tue and Ao La bays have seen a hike in Phuket-based diving and snorkeling tour operators coming to the island in recent years.

There are four dive shops on Racha Yai, which, together with dive shops on Phuket's main island, attract more than 200 divers a day during the high season.

But when tourists numbers soar, so does the quantity of trash the island produces.

Building on the island is also a cause for concern.

Three five-star hotels, four boutique hotel resorts, three restaurants and 16 local families today occupy the 3,000 square kilometer island, and together produce about one tonne of reusable trash each week.

But the association is deter-

mined to solve Koh Racha Yai's environmental woes, and maybe make a baht or two in the process.

Association members have pegged glass bottles as the major offending trash item and have funded an ingenious glassgrinding recycling machine.

Designed by the President of the Thai Industrial Development Forum Dr Woothiwong Toatong and put in place six months ago, the machine, which cost about 140,000 baht, is a oneoff in Thailand.

Association public relations officer, 45-year-old Sopon 'Bang Ke' Sukharind said it takes just 20 minutes for the machine to grind 200 kilograms of glass bottles into minuscule shards of glass.

The club intend to crush about 1,000 kilograms per week.

Once ground, the mounds of glass shards, which resemble grains of sand, are transferred to Phuket and sold to construction companies for use in concrete mixing.

In a recent move, the association plans to make their own concrete mix to build a twotonne cinder block, which will be sunk just off Koh Racha Yai's shoreline and used as a permanent mooring for arriving vessels.

Mr Sopon said the association had also engineered a second recycling machine for Koh Racha, but the additional unit would be used for plastic materials. The association are in the process of building a sheltering structure and loading dock for the second machine.

Under the banner of the association's 'No Burn, No Bury'

project, Koh Racha Yai residents now have numerous trash depositories around the island for sorting waste into different categories.

For a fee of 300 baht per month, the association also provides local businesses with new color-coded bins; black bins for food waste, yellow for plastic, blue for metal and red for glass.

Since the color coded bins were introduced six months ago Mr Sopon said the project is working well but needs additional funding from Rawai Municipality, the local government office responsible for Koh Racha Yai. Koh Racha Yai's en-

vironmental strife made headlines in early December when more than 100 villagers from Koh Racha Yai gathered outside Phuket Provincial Hall to protest against a new resort development they claimed was disrupting their way of life and destroying the environment.

The protesters, led by Chakrit Chandee of the Koh Racha Environmental Conservation and Protection Association, handed a letter to Phuket Governor Wichai

Phraisa-ngop in which they made three allegations against the Raya Buri Group, the company constructing the new resort: That the company had blocked an important thoroughfare on the island, preventing villagers from going about their business;

That two barges carrying building materials for the project damaged a coral reef in Siam Bay, on the island's northeast coastline; that the company started construction of the resort without government approval.

The issue is ongoing.

Luxury property sales top Bt1.1bn

huket's luxury property market saw transactions worth 1.1 billion baht for the period of July through November last year, according to market research by leading Thai consulting firm C9 Hotelworks.

A growing resale sector accounted for 50 percent of the sales.

According to Bill Barnett, Managing Director of C9, "this year has seen the absence of new high end product which has propelled the secondary segment, while off plan product remains sluggish."

Adding further, Mr Barnett commented that "the failure to launch new projects is a key constraining factor limiting volume in the marketplace.

Despite demonstrated sales of a number of 'super' high-end villas from 165 to 330 million baht, developers remain on the sideline, more out of negative risk concern then fundamentals."

Market data pinpoints that a growing number of early purchasers in developments are now cashing out at substantial profit levels, thus pushing up pricing points for existing real estate product.

Geographically, Kamala's Millionaire's Mile has experienced the highest level of activity.

product entering the supply steam, the second half of 2009 has seen a growing number of premium ocean view lots transacted with buyers set to develop their own luxury residences.

"Traditionally the period of Without significant new December to April remains peak sales season, and feedback in the past few weeks has seen sales traction," said Mr Barnett

"Ultimately, the market desperately requires new launches to stimulate broader interest if there is to be a return to stabilized trading," Mr Barnett concluded.

New Phuket flyover under consideration

The Highways Department is currently studying the possibility of building a flyover or tunnel to relieve traffic congestion at the Darasamuth School Intersection near Central Festival.

The first in a series of five planned public hearings on the issue took place at The Metropole Hotel on December 24.

The Highways Department has included the project in its 10-year development plan from 2007 to 2016.

First phase work on the project's Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) is already underway by project consultants Thai Engineering Consultants (TEC) Company Ltd.

As part of the EIA process, four more public hearings must take place by the end of June.

Attending the hearing were government officers, local business people and residents.

Khasame Srivaranun, who heads the Phuket Highways Department survey, construction and planning division, said the first meeting was simply to introduce the project to the public.

Four alternative structural plans for a flyover or tunnel are under consideration, he said.

His agency has been informed that land expropriation 'was not an option' in the area, which has some of the highest land prices on the island.

"We are studying all engineering, environment and funding aspects and we will listen to all public comments. If the people of Phuket do not want this project, it will be canceled," he said.

The final design will include a plan for an improved drainage system to address frequent flooding on sections of the bypass road.

The owner of the newly-opened Dara Hotel, which is very close to the proposed project site, said he was strongly opposed to

Copenhagen calling

fter the recent and controversial Climate Change Conference in Copenhagen, many people have been asking me how Thailand specifically Phuket – will be affected by the summit.

It is not an easy question to answer, but it is an important one.

To begin, let me report the words used by US President Obama, addressing the leaders who attended that summit:

"The time for talk is over... It is better for us to act than talk.

"Or we can choose delay, falling back into the same divisions that have stood in the way of action for years. And we will be back having the same stale arguments month after month, year after year, all while the danger of climate change grows

until it is irreversible."

message. I love hearing these kinds of words from global leaders on international television.

Unfortunately, a number of key countries were holding out against the overall package.

Despite these problems, diplomats somehow reached a deal after hours of tense negotiations, even though no country was 'entirely satisfied' with the agreement.

To make a long story short, the accord reached is a tentative agreement that requires a second and more binding accord to be reached within 12 months.

With just about everyone wondering what real changes will be made as a result of the summit, many local residents are asking: What will the effect be in Thailand?

I'm afraid it doesn't look like there will be many immediate changes. Thailand's existing environmental laws are not bad, but their enforcement is a completely separate issue.

I will try to exemplify the matter with a case that happened to me, just after the summit in Copenhagen was concluded.

As many readers know, I'm It was a strong and clear constructing a condo that implements practical environmental technologies. These technologies represent one of the few – if not the sole – examples of practical applications of going green in a real and sustainable way.

As unbelievable as it was, his answer was that he would very much like to apply the technologies, but due to the present

financial constraints in the market, he must decide against them in order to increase his margin of profit.

I don't know if I made good decision, but I gently rejected his proposal, even though it was a lucrative deal. It made an impression, though; for a moment I saw all my research and ideas thrown away in the name of profit.

I think this example gives an idea of the conservative behaviors that will likely dictate the decisions of many developers in the near future throughout Thailand and Phuket.


Some developers have coined the term, 'eco-Phuket', and invited people to support the concept of Phuket going clean and green. I sometimes wonder what this term means, but it can help increase awarness about global climate change.

I want to be confident in the future. We cannot leave Phuket without proper infrastructure (a decent sewage system) or with the problems of waste disposal or indiscriminate development. Much like the goal of using terms like 'eco-Phuket', this begins with increasing awareness. Copenhagen was a half failure, but it was an important event to open the eyes of millions of people and a number of countries.


Moreover, we must consider the future economic impact on Thailand from the global climate crises: the cost of additional infrastructure for a growing population, natural disaster responses, crop losses and additional public health problems. How much easier would these problems be if they were addressed as part of an international plan to combat global warming?

I presume the Thai government will take action in the near future to purchase products and services – including those in real estate and construction – that meet minimal sustainability standards. This could start with the use of an energy label on construction materials for commercial real estate and

Getting in on the condo act

Reforms augment the appeal of completed condo market

laws on condominiums in Thailand have already raised the interest of all who know about them and may be considering purchasing property in Thailand.

The amendments to the Condominium Act have provided consumers with protection unseen prior to July 2008 when they were introduced.

Although investors may have become more careful and risk aware, the purchase of completed condominium units has become a popular option, particularly in the current global economic downturn, which has badly affected the property industry in Thailand.

Property developers are of course seeing far lower sales rates, forcing them into construction delays or, when the cash flow gap cannot be bridged, outright abandonment of projects. Wary of this, the few buyers who remain in the market now tend to eschew off-plan purchases and focus on completed properties such as condominium units.

Typically, purchase of a completed condominium unit is made by either assignment of contractual purchase rights, earlier granted by a developer

The latest revisions to the to a property buyer, to a subsequent buyer; sale or resale from an original buyer and registered owner of a unit to a new buyer.

> The first option usually applies in cases where a sale from an initial 'buyer' to another buyer is facilitated after completion of a unit, but just before registration of title transfer from a developer to the initial buyer.

Mostly known by the more experienced property industry people as "multiple investor property flipping", the practice is widespread in rapidly rising, and often highly speculative, property markets.

Re-sale of a unit before registration of title transfer usually helps the initial buyer, now the 'seller' but really only a purchase rights holder, to pass off to the new owner of the unit the contractual tax responsibilities arising from registration of title transfer.

The second option, a sale or re-sale of a condominium unit after registration of title transfer from one owner to another, can be completed by simple further title transfer from the original buyer to his new buyer. This is done at the competent land department office, as described under a Condominium Unit Sale and Purchase Agreement executed by and between the unit's owner and the new buyer.

Advantage of purchasing a completed condominium unit from a registered owner, rather than taking on an assignment of contractual purchase rights prior to issuance of the title deed pertaining to the unit, is obvious. It allows a buyer to reduce to almost zero the potential risk of non-completion or inability to register title transfer for any reason.

However, this significantly lower risk might well be reflected in a considerably higher purchase

Nevertheless, whenever purchasing a completed unit from its registered owner, comprehensive due diligence is essential in order to further minimize potential risks and ensure that a fair and balanced Sale and Purchase Agreement will be executed to satisfy a buyer's individual requirements as well as all others for a safe, sensible and sound investment.

It is extremely important to verify that all documentation required to assume ownership of a condominium unit will be

obtained, including but not limited to a letter issued by a Condominium Juristic Person (CJP), certifying that overall foreign ownership in the condominium itself has not exceeded 49% of the total space in the condominium, and that the condominium unit vendor has no outstanding debts with the CJP.

Furthermore, it needs to be demonstrated to the land department when applying for registration of title transfer that

the person into whose name the unit is to be transferred has imported into Thailand the purchase price funds required for the purchase.


