Frenchman fleeced in banking bungle

FRENCHMAN is demanding damages from his Thai bank after it let a fellow Frenchman with the same name empty his account of at least 164,000 baht.

Last November, Claude Alfred Francois Marie Prigent walked into Siam Commercial Bank at Chalong Circle and asked for a new ATM card and bank book. The bank obliged.

But the 60-year-old Claude Prigent in the bank that day was not the 67-year-old Claude Prigent who held an account at the branch.

The older Claude Prigent has lived in Rawai for three years. He is balding, wears glasses and stands 1.68m tall.

The man who walked out with the card was 1.75m tall with a full head of hair, according to a copy of his passport.

With his namesake's ATM card in hand, the younger Claude Prigent made a series of withdrawals in Phuket and Pattaya in November and December.

On January 16, he spent more than 16,000 baht on duty free goods in Suvarnabhumi Airport, then took a flight to the Philippines.

In Manila he continued to

empty Claude Prigent's bank account, spending at least 164,000 baht before his namesake realized anything was wrong.

The 'real' Claude Prigent put his rapidly dwindling funds down to his own festive overindulgence.

"I noticed at Christmas and New Year that I'd been going through a lot of cash. I thought, 'best cut down on the spending'. But I didn't realize someone else was spending the money for me," he said.

On January 18, his card was rejected by a store in Phuket. When he checked his balance he was shocked to discover only 4,000 baht left.

He went to his branch the next day. The bank was quick to admit it was at fault, yet it refused to pay the money back straight away.

Hunt for Supercheap woman's killer

OLICE are hunting for the boyfriend of a Supercheap employee found strangled to death in her room on February 24.

Miss Thipkasen 'Khwan' Heep-phech, 24, was found in her room in Koh Kaew by a colleague after she was absent from work for two days. She had a mobile telephone charger cord wrapped around her neck and a pillow over her face.

Police believe the native of Nakhon Sri Thammarat may have been raped.

Miss Monthira Saiyarin, who found the body, said Miss Thipkasen was always cheerful, well-liked by colleagues and never had any arguments with anyone.

Miss Monthira's supervisor told her to go and look for Miss Thipkasen after she missed work for two days in a row and could not be reached by telephone

Miss Monthira found the door to her colleague's room unlocked. Inside, possessions were scattered all over the floor.

Before her death, Miss Thipkasen had been seeing a man named 'Khao', Miss Monthira said.

She did not know his full name, she added.

Mr Khao paid the victim's rent and bought her a motorbike, she said.

The pair recently had an argument after Mr Khao asked Miss Thipkasen to return money he had given her, Miss Monthira said

She had not seen the man since then, she added.

Police believe Thipkasen was killed at least two days before her body was discovered. Officers are now hunting Mr Khao to question him about the killing.

Historic building about to go baba

HE PHUKET Peranakan Association is seeking donations to help transform the old Standard Chartered Bank building into a 50-million-baht cultural museum.

The classic two-story Sino-Portuguese building at the corner of Phuket and Phang Nga Roads in Phuket Town will be designated as the 'Phuket Provincial Baba Museum'.

Phuket Peranakan Association president Dr Kosol Tenguthai said the group is raising funds from public and private sources.

The association hopes to start construction in six months. Work should take about six months, and if all goes to plan the museum could open in early 2011, he said.

The bank building, which used to house a police unit, is now empty.

Formerly under the Treasury Department, the

structure was consigned over to Phuket City Municipality, which has already authorized its use as a museum.

The museum will feature permanent exhibits of antique items and displays about Peranakan culture. Most of the items will be donated by local residents as well as Peranakan communities in the region, including Malaysia's Langkawi Island and parts of Indonesia. There will also be a collection of history books to educate new generations about Phuket's tin mining trade and past ways of life.

Peranakan culture began when 14th-century Chinese merchants settled in the town of Malacca in present-day Malaysia.

The mostly male Hakka Chinese traders married local women. Their male offspring were known as 'Baba', while females were called 'Nyonya'.

The culture then developed and spread to communities in Malaysia and Indonesia as well as Thailand.

Tuk-tuk to the rescue

SHARP-EYED tuk-tuk driver last week returned a lost wallet to a Russian couple on holiday in Patong. Seree Yodthueng, 48, noticed the wallet in the back of an unmanned tuk-tuk belonging to a fellow driver.

The wallet contained 5,540 baht in cash, credit cards, an ATM card and an undisclosed amount of foreign currency.

Manager of the Siam Commercial Bank Branch at Chalong Circle, Thurdsak Chusak, said the bank had to make sure the two men hadn't colluded to defraud the bank.

While the bank's board was deliberating over the case, Claude Prigent was having to rearrange his finances.

"Having my account blocked meant my retirement money could no longer be credited to my account. My French bank wanted a new account number, which they wouldn't accept by fax. It took six weeks to sort out," he said.

"Luckily I have another account in France to withdraw from, otherwise how could I have survived?" he added.

Eventually the bank got to

the bottom of the affair.

Mr Thurdsak said Claude Alfred Francois Marie Prigent had tried to open an account at one of the bank's branches on Koh Chang.

"A bank officer there told him there was another account under the same name in Phuket showing on the monitor," he said.

"He probably tricked the officer into giving out more information about the account, like how much money was in it and where the branch was," he said.

The man then filed a police report, saying he had lost his Siam Commercial Bank ATM card and bank book, Mr Thurdsak said.

Police report in hand, he walked into the Chalong Circle Branch.

"The officer didn't want to annoy the customer or inconvenience him any more, so he didn't really look at the passport number," Mr Thurdsak admitted.

Satisfied that the 'real' Claude Prigent was indeed the victim of a crime, on February 24 Siam Commercial Bank credited his account with 164,000 baht.

Feeling this is not enough, Mr Prigent wants compensation for the inconvenience the affair has caused him.

The bank said it has refunded his money and he will have to prove any additional expenses the affair caused him.


"The banking system needs to clean up its act. There are cracks in their system," Mr Prigent said.

Mr Thurdsak said the bank would set new regulations to prevent the same thing from happening again.

Meanwhile, the whereabouts of the mysterious Claude Alfred Francois Marie Prigent remain unknown.

Both Siam Commercial Bank and Claude Prigent agree he should face charges.

"We've told the police and immigration to lock him up right away if he ever comes to Thailand again," Mr Thurdsak said.





WO men who were set to paddle 14,000 miles from Phuket to California in a kayak have been forced to postpone their trip due to 'financial constraints'.

American Ryan Doran, 26, and Piya 'Mr X' Sukunthai, 28, were due to leave Phuket on March 10 aboard their 20-foot wooden kayak Say-Lee.

The pair insist their dream trip will still happen, but say it must be postponed until they raise enough money for all the equipment needed.

The pair's voyage was due to take 20 months. It would have seen them pass through territorial waters of Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Taiwan, Japan and Russia before braving a 217-mile leg across the Bering Sea, one of the world's most treacherous expanses of ocean.

From there, they planned to continue on to Alaska and Canada, then the lower 48 United States, arriving in Ryan's home city of San Francisco in December next year.

But the pair have had to postpone their trans-Pacific paddle until an unspecified date later this year. They are now trying to sell their Phuketmade kayak Say-Lee to raise funds to build a new 18-foot 'catamaran' kayak, which would be used in the mega-

system. We now intend to be sailing and paddling. We are also using kites to help power the boat," he revealed.

There have been numerous criticisms in the Gazette Forum charging the pair with being overambitious, impractical or downright crazy.

To one of these comments, Ryan replied:

"You're right that this is not a 'safe, well-planned adventure', but it is a well-planned adventure...We have planned this trip for two years and have assessed all risks. If the s**t hits the fan, we will pay for our own rescue.'

The trip would be insured through International SOS, an international medical and rescue service, he added.

"The extreme at-sea conditions will inevitably affect us: sores, heat exhaustion, sunstroke, dehydration, starvation, hypothermia, not to mention the

psychological hardships involved in this trip," he wrote.

"I know our plan says 20 months, but if it takes 10 years, then so be it. It took Oskar Speck seven years to paddle from Germany to Australia. We are prepared for that kind of commitment," he said, speaking of an epic paddle undertaken in the 1930s.

Responding to a sarcastic comment that climactic conditions in the Bering Sea and at Nai Harn Beach are quite different and that the Phathum Thani born Mr X might find them too harsh, Ryan replied:

"No, Mr X has never been in cold weather before... Assuming we actually make it to the Bering Sea, we will have paddled thousands of miles through the South China Sea and off the coast of Japan and Russia.

"If we make it as far as the Bering Sea, I think he will be pretty well conditioned for the weather. But thanks for pointing out that the Bering Sea is not Nai Harn Beach. We didn't know that."

Ryan and Mr X are still looking for additional sponsors for their trip.

Thus far, John Harris from Chesapeake Light Craft (CLC) Boats and Bennet Bar from the NRS Kayaking Team are the only official sponsors.

New bus station to open mid-2010

Office appears resigned to run the new Phuket Provincial Bus Terminal by itself after two local governing bodies have apparently lost interest in operating the facility.

Work on the new station was completed in early December, but efforts by the Transport Office to find a local government body to administer operations there appear to have failed.

Initially, both the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO) and Rassada Municipality showed interest.

Now Rassada Municipality, where the station is located, says it is 'not ready' to operate the station.

The PPAO, run by its

THE Phuket Land Transport fiscally conservative president Paiboon Upatising, is also no longer interested in running the station, according to wellinformed sources.

> With the station lying idle for three months already, the Phuket Land Transport Office now has little choice but to ask the Transport Ministry in Bangkok for additional funding to run the station on its own.

> "Hopefully we will be able to open it by the middle of the year," said Phuket Land Transport Director Kanok Siripanichkorn.




Tambon Rassada has yet to approve construction, he said.

Inside Vachira Phuket's

he Phuket Police are fighting a war on drugs. Rarely does a week go by without fresh arrests for narcotics possession, ranging from kids caught with a handful of pills to dealers trading shipments worth hundreds of thousands of baht. But while the police battle with the drug trade is well publicized, the island's hospitals are quietly treating addicts. **Atchaa Khamlo** reports from Vachira Phuket Hospital's drug treatment center, where she talked to patients and the professionals helping them to kick the habit.

ui is 20 years old, pretty and five months' pregnant. She is also a recovering crystal meth addict. Pui is attending Vachira's drug treatment program, trying to free herself from a habit that saw her blow tens of thousands of baht on the drug known in Thai as ya *ice* every month.

"I started on ya bah [methamphetamine]. I began taking ice after I heard it would make my skin whiter and more beautiful. If I had money, it went on ya ice. It made me feel dreamy but wide awake, so I could stay up all night. I thought I could stop taking the drug by myself, but the more I took, the more addicted I got and it became hard to stop," she said.

BANGKOK HOSPITAL

Unaware her daughter was on drugs, Pui's mother was sending her money from Phang Nga. "I once spent 30,000 baht in two weeks on crystal meth," Pui said. "Then I got caught."

Getting arrested for drugs possession landed her in one of Vachira's drug treatment classes, which she now attends along with seven other addicts. Patients take an 11-class course modeled on a drug and alcohol treatment program pioneered by the Matrix Institute in Los Angeles.

Psychiatrist Dr Tappana Sumpatanarax heads the program.

"Addicts must attend 11 different lessons aimed at changing their opinions about drugs," he said.

"They learn about their bodies, their minds and society. The program will alter their ideas, helping them to stop taking drugs and break the cycle of addiction."

The scheme started in 2003 during Thailand's controversial War on Drugs, during which it is alleged hundreds of dealers were killed extra-judiciously.

The program got underway with 20 confessed addicts. There are now more than one hundred enrolled in small classes, ranging in size from eight to ten patients. A team of 10 professionals runs the program: three doctors, two psychiatrists and five social

patients end up the center. Either they are ordered to attend drug treatment by a court, they decide to seek treatment by themselves, or they are brought in by relatives after they start to display serious mental health issues. Most fall into the first group: overall, 80% are sent to the program by the probation office. Of these, around 80% are male.

According to Phuket Public Health Office, from October 1, 2008 to September 30, 2009, 97 people voluntarily signed up to drug treatment programs in Phuket, while 581 were forced into treatment by the probation service. Besides Vachira Phuket, patients are treated at other government hospitals, local public health stations and the Phuket Juvenile Observation and Protection Center.

Of the people who volunteered for treatment, 82 were men and 15 were women. Of these, 52 were in for ya bah, 13 for marijuana, two for inhalants, 20 for Mitragyna Speciosa (krathom leaf), one for ya ice, three for antidepressants, two for heroin, and four for other addictive substances.

Tricky business

Rehabilitating drug addicts is difficult work. At Vachira, just one in 10 of the patients successfully complete the course; the rest disappear.

The hospital informs the probation office when this happens, although many are never seen again, Dr Tappana said.

"Those who come in to cure themselves voluntarily almost always complete the course." Around 80% of the patients who complete the course are able to kick their habits, he said.

Course attendees come from a variety of backgrounds. "We are starting to get to know each other now and we're talking a lot more. It's good to make friends," said Pui, the young mother-to-be from Phang Nga.

The classes have helped her realize the effects her addiction to ya ice could have on her baby and her own brain. "When I saw my friends taking the drug, its smell made me want to take it. Picturing my unborn baby inside me stopped me from thinking like that," she said.

Jack, 18, was arrested for ya bah possession and ordered by the probation office to attend a class every two days.

"I started taking ya bah after being urged by friends," he said. "I don't think I'll buy the drug again because I don't want to go back to jail. I just got off spending six days in Bang Jo detention center in Thalang.'

Moo, a 33-year-old man from Phuket, got caught with ya bah in October last year. "I'd been taking it since my early twenties. Not constantly, just for

fun. I wasn't addicted. I feel very sorry for my family as my parents as my wife tried everything to help me to get out of jail. They had to work so hard. I'll never go back to the drug again."

Back to reality

There are seven symptoms addicts generally display on entering the program at Vachira, Dr Tappana explained: insomnia, lack of appetite, mood swings, auditory hallucinations, visual hallucinations, paranoia and anxiety.

Vachira Hospital differs from other institutions in that it is more likely to treat psychological symptoms with drugs, he said.

"Because Phuket is a tourist destination, if something bad happens after a patient goes crazy, it will damage the island's reputation and harm tourism," he said.

Those patients who fail to complete the course quickly enough are sent on tougher courses in other organizations, such as 'boot camps' in Surat Thani and Nakhon Sri Thammarat.

Patients with more serious conditions, such as amentia (mental retardation) used to be sent to Suansaranrom Psychiatric Center in Surat Thani or another center in Songkhla. But with both of those centers filled for the past year, patients have been kept at Vachira, Dr Tappana said.

"I want people to be aware of the dangers of all kinds of drugs, even anti-obesity and drug as ya bah. It gives the same

"Marijuana addicts are six times more likely to have panic attacks than normal people. The panic attack will make the addict feel like his heart is shaking. They experience the same type of panic you get when standing looking down from a high building or drinking four cups of coffee in one go," he said.

Dr Tappana said it typically takes human brains about four months to recover from drug-induced damage. But if a drug is taken repeatedly, some parts of the brain cannot recover, he said.

"Ya ice is the same kind of

about committing suicide, while 50% of suicides have a history of drug use, Dr Tappana said.

Like many healthcare professionals, he favors treatment over imprisonment.

"I think we should place more importance on drug treatment instead of the government's policy of emphasizing the arrest of drug addicts," he said.

Those seeking treatment for substance abuse should contact the Psychaiatic Ward at Vachira Phuket Hospital. Cost of the 11class course is 4,600 baht, not including any medications that might be required. Foreigners are welcome to attend, but the language of instruction is Thai. Peeping Tom exposed

UDON THANI: Police are questioning the owner of a women's dormitory after residents found CCTV cameras hidden in their bedrooms and bathrooms.

The cameras were first spotted by 24-year-old Phornphat Kimsee as she was taking a shower in the early hours of Feb-

Miss Phornphat, who manages a branch of fast food chain Chester's Grill, said she looked up and noticed a small round hole next to the light bulb.

Somewhat perturbed, she dressed and called her friends. The group pulled up a chair and removed the ceiling panel. There was a small CCTV camera hidden in the ceiling. A wire led from the camera out of the room.

Her four friends went back to check their rooms. All found CCTV cameras hidden in their bedroom ceilings. The group went to the dormitory owner, 38year-old Winnu Bandit, to see if he knew anything about the cameras. He denied all knowledge.

The following morning, the group reported their find to police. On further investigation, officers found the wires from the cameras led out of the dormitory building to the house of Mr Winnu. The cables stopped just short of Mr Winnu's computer and, according to the police, looked like they had been freshly cut. The hard drive was also missing from the computer.

Mr Winnu told police that he had cut the cables years ago, but forgotten to remove the cameras. He said he first installed the cameras to spy on male tenants who he claims were causing trouble. Later he decided to rent rooms only to women and cut the cables to the cameras, he said. Mr Winnu claimed there was no hard drive in the computer because it was being repaired.

Inspector Singharach Kaowketmee from Muang Udon Thani Police said officers were investigating whether Mr Winnu had a license to run a dormitory.

As for charges relating to the cameras, Lt Col Singharach said police were still trying to establish the facts.

Truckers' quarrel ends in tragedy

RATCHABURI: A young truck driver was killed on February 23 after being hit by an 18-wheeler. He was trying to escape another truck driver who was chasing him with a cleaver at the time.

At the scene, in Ban Pong District, police found the body of 18-year-old Suksan Channarong lying on the road near his truck.

Witnesses reported that Mr Suksan had been duelling with another truck driver, each trying to overtake the other. The pair then parked their trucks to confront each other.

The driver of the other vehicle got out of his cab and went

for Mr Suksan with a cleaver. Mr Suksan fled across the road, but was hit by the 18-wheeler. Mr Suksan's adversary drove off.

Police are now hunting the driver of the 18-wheeler, who left his vehicle and fled the scene on foot.

Karaoke killing

KRABI: A teenager was killed and another three seriously injured when a dispute over whose turn it was to sing karaoke turned deadly on February 23.

The incident happened at a wedding party at a bar on the Krabi-Ao Luek road.

Around 12:15am, two groups of youths were dancing in front of the stage and singing karaoke. When a member of one group tried to wrest the microphone from the other group, a fight broke out.

Things escalated and two of the youths drew guns – one 9mm pistol and one shotgun – and opened fire.

Kittiphong Yotroisap, 17, was hit in the stomach and arm. He died of his injuries. Three other men received bullet wounds.

Police said they already know the identities of the gunmen.

Karaoke is a major cause of disputes in South East Asia, where lapses in etiquette or criticism of other singers are often met with violence.

In one of Thailand's most famous cases, in Songkhla in 2008, a man shot eight of his neighbours dead after they sang John Denver's Country Road one too many times.

Half a million workers facing deportation

BANGKOK: Authorities are getting ready to deport about half a million Burmese, Laotian and Cambodian workers because they failed to seek new work permits or submit requests for nationality verification within the deadline.

March 2 was the last day for the 1.3 million or so Burmese, Laotian and Cambodian people working in Thailand to hand over requests or applications to the authorities. This is a mandatory step for workers who have already registered in Thailand's labour market in recent years.

'We will not be lenient," **Employment Department deputy** director-general Supat Gukun said. His department would work closely with the police and the Immigration Bureau to enforce the law, he added.

Mr Supat insisted the nationality verification process was not very complicated.

"For extra convenience, employers can hire one of 12 certified private companies to handle the task of verifying the nationality of their workers for no more than 5,000 baht per head," he added.

Many employers have sought the service, with the companies earning more than a total of 1 billion baht.

The nationality verification

process has recently been made mandatory, in addition to the longexisting requirement for alien workers to carry a work permit.

The process has two main steps. Employers fill nationality verification forms and submit them to the Labour Ministry, which forwards them to the governments of Burma, Laos and Cambodia for verification.

Once the documents are verified, the alien workers can return home to get passports. Thailand has given alien workers until 2012 to get their passports.


Meanwhile, Human Rights and Development Foundation chairman Gothom Arya urged the government to not deport alien workers who failed to meet the March 2 deadline.

"Some Burmese workers feel their lives are at risk if they have to go back to their country. Political and ethnic conflicts are still going on there," he said.

He also urged the government to extend the deadline for registered alien workers' nationality verification.

Mr Gothom said if Thai authorities refused, many Burmese workers would simply go underground and live here illegally.





Scott Duncanson

Scott Duncanson is the General Manager – Southern Operations for Property Care Services, a major provider of integrated security, facility management, pest control, janitorial and gardening services to many of Phuket's finest resorts, hospitals and villa projects.

He came to Phuket in 1999 as Operations Manager for Securicor, a high end security company with a fleet of armored cars for bank operations. He opened the company's first office at Canal Village and by the end of 2000 was providing security for all five of the resorts at Laguna Phuket.

Scott was born in Adelaide, Australia and spent his childhood racing yachts with his father. The family business, Duncanson Offshore Yachts, provided him with a direction for study. He completed a four year apprenticeship to become a shipwright and built his own 8 meter junior offshore group racing yacht.

"My dad and I started with a piece of paper and designed the sloop. We built it and achieved second place in the Victoria State Championships."

Scott went on to win the Junior Offshore Group international championship during the 1988 Australia Bicentennial, and the Australian National Championship the following year. In 1990, he was named

South Australian Yachtsman of the Year and nominated as Australian Sportsman of the Year.

Duncanson Offshore Yachts built the first computer program utilizing Auto CAD to control machines to cut components for boats.

In the early 1990s, the company expanded operations to Thailand. Scott moved to the eastern seaboard at Sattahip as the Thai Navy and Ital Thai offered contract work to build naval patrol boats and oil rig supply ships.

"Using AutoCAD, we computer modeled the vessels in 3D and programmed the machines to cut aluminum and steel components."

He spent the next three years working to establish the family business and meet contract demands.

He then joined the faculty at the Laem Chabang School of Engineering, a subsidiary of Melbourne's Swinburne University, to teach the use of Auto CAD and Auto CAMachining software. He held this position until 1998.

"One day I was called by Julian Haskard, GM of Securicor Thailand, who I had met when he was working in Hong Kong in security operations. We had supplied patrol boats to his regiment. He asked me to sail from Phuket to Langkawi. This turned into a three day interview."

Scott moved to Phuket to

head up operations for Securicor.

"I was ready for a new adventure and Phuket is hard to resist. The company offered a very professional international standard of security with its motto, *Global Expertise, Local Understanding*, and I looked forward to the challenge."

His new duties included training staff in bank support services, ATM replenishment, cash in transit, and providing security services to five-star resorts. His client list included Bangkok Bank, JW Marriott, Twin Palms, and Mom Tri's Boathouse, in addition to the Laguna Phuket properties. By 2005, he was supervising 360 staff.


Scott returned to his love of sailing when he moved to Phuket. He was helmsman on the winning *Fine Pitch* in the 2000 King's Cup Regatta. In 2002, he designed a new class of boat, the Phuket Sports 8, with his father. It was then built by Mark Horwood of Latitude 8 and went on to win two more King's Cup regattas, in 2007 and 2008.

"The Phuket Sports 8 is quite demanding to sail. One requires the strength of a wrestler and the balance of a ballerina. Six of them have been built to date."

He has served on the Phangnga Bay Regatta Committee and as Commodore of the Ao Chalong Yacht Club.

Now he spends most of his time supervising his more than 800 staff working around the Andaman region to keep it clean and secure.



Me and My Mac

Making Macs hard to hack



Wrong. As long as there are bad people in the world, your computer is never completely safe. The good news is that there are several security measures built right into Mac OS X to keep you protected.

safe, right?

The first and most important thing to remember is passwords. Use a good one!

Things like "password" and "12345678" are not strong passwords. The best protection comes from using a combination of upper and lowercase letters and numbers. Apple's operating system includes a password assistant that tells you how good your password is.

There is one important



Mac users frequently brag about enjoying a higher level of security than their PC counterparts. Much of this is due to Apple's innovative security programs, but even the most secure systems require users to practice smart protective measures.

password that most people don't know about or set: the firmware password. It makes sure that anyone who doesn't know the password can't boot your Mac from any disc other than the startup

disc. In other words, if someone steals your computer, they won't be able to boot from and install DVD (basically reinstall the operating system to make your computer their own) without the

password, rendering your stolen Mac a big paperweight for the thief. Serves them right! A word of caution here: if you forget it, you can't reset it and there is no hint to help you remember.

Each computer should only have one administrator. There are many things an 'admin' account can do that others can't; like install and uninstall applications, adjust system preferences, and create new users.

When the same Mac has multiple users, each user should have a standard account or an account with limited access, such as parental controls for children. People who will only use your Mac once should login using the guest account. When they log out, the guest account will delete the contents of its home folder.

As the admin user, you should also disable automatic login. Entering your password each time really helps keep your computer secure.

The 'keychain' is a great example of Apple's software engineering. It lets the computer store your passwords all in one place, so you don't have to memorize them all. However, if you leave your Mac for a moment while it is still booted up, anyone can come by and access your keychain.

To prevent this, you can adjust your settings so that your Mac goes to sleep whenever you walk away, so that a password is required when you come back. You can also adjust the keychain

access settings so that the keychain locks after a given time or whenever the computer goes to sleep. I prefer the second one. Until a password is entered, nobody can access your IM client, checking your credit cards or email. It even stops applications that use passwords from getting new data.

Another feature that is built into Mac OSX is called "sand-boxing". It takes applications you have downloaded and isolates then from your other files and applications. It won't let these new applications access files or folders other than its own until you say it is OK. This is particularly helpful the first time you open an application downloaded from the web.

Virus protection is a very sensitive issue for Mac users. Most don't use virus protection because they think they don't need it. This is true for the most part, but compared to Windows PCs, only a fraction of the malware out there targets Macs. However, it only takes one virus to cause severe damage.

Better safe than sorry.

The most popular anti-virus software for Mac is from www.intego.com. Dual protection is available for those of you using Windows and OS X on the same Mac.

Last but not least (and this might sound like a no-brainer), the best way to protect your Mac is to not leave it lying around.

If you have it with you, nobody can use it, take it, or try to hack into it.

Economic stumble may sanction stimulus

merica's central bank, the US Federal Reserve, decided in late February to raise its discount rate to 0.75%.

At at first glance, this may not appear to be a significant move, but it is the first change in interest rates.

Naturally, the discount rate is not of great importance as it simply reflects the rate that banks requiring central bank assistance can borrow money.

The trend is important, as it is the first indication that the Federal Reserve is seeing those first, elusive shoots of recovery for the US economy.

However, most analysts believe an increase in the key Federal Funds Rate is many months away.

The financial crisis spread its tentacles into many areas of the US economy, so economic recovery this time is likely to be different from other recessions, but with the simulative effect of all these Federal packages still helping the economy, it is still very difficult to assess how the economy will react without

Assuming the worst: that the US economy will stumble later this year towards a 'double dip', more stimulus will be added.

Basically, it will be a matter of having to rescue the economy, regardless of cost.

Any concerns that this will lead to a more indebted America

Most economists agree that the US is not yet in a debt trap; the level of government debt is presently high, but assuming that government spending will fall as a percentage of the Gross Domestic Product in the future, the US economy's position will be sustainable.

However, the future political will to run a sustainable economy is still of great concern as claims for social security, health care and many other issues continue to rise.

Unemployment in the US has fallen slightly but it is likely to be a lagging indicator going forward. The aftermath of the recession in 2001 showed that unemployment takes time to fall. That recession was a very mild compared to the latest.

The nature of employment this time around promises to be very different; before, many of the jobs created were in construction and the real estate sector. It is very unlikely that these areas will lead the way in this recovery.

The latest report from the (US) National Association for Business Economics (NABE)is

optimistic: stating that they see a 'healthy expansion underway'.

What does come as a pleasant surprise is their positive outlook for the housing market: home prices are expected to rise 1.6% in 2010 and 2.6% in 2011.

Rising home prices may be muted but they are going in the right direction.

Another big surprise is the NABE's outlook for the stockmarket. They expect the key index – the S&P 500 – to rise expenses. 23% by the end of 2011.

The opposite side of that coin is that stockmarkets would become even more concerned if there was an absence of interest rate rises in the face of economic growth.

That would mean the inflation genie was being let out of the bottle.

A recovery with rising interest rates is called, in stockmarket terms, "climbing a wall of worry" but this is a natural phenomena and very different from panic in markets.

According to the current consensus the US consumer is still going to only have a weak tone in demand.

Should that prove to be the case then the possible Fed Fund rate increases will be postponed.

Fed Chairman Bernanke is an ex-economics professor at Princeton University and he is acknowledged as an "expert" on the causes of the Great Depression in the 1930s and into the 1940s.

One of the lessons is don't raise interest rates or drain liquidity until an economic recovery is definitely underway.

The US consumer may be weak but they are also deleveraging; in other words, paying off debt and that was the cause of the crisis in the first place.

Assuming that the US recovery is on track, this is very good news for the global economy.

The US may account for an ever reducing percentage of the world economy but it is still the largest individual economy by a very long way.



urrently there's a controversy going on about the proliferation of environmentally unfriendly plastic bags. Some local supermarkets, department stores, and shopping malls have been in the process of implementing a policy that will charge a small fee - say one or two baht – for each plastic bag they provide to customers.

On a recent visit to Taiwan, I discovered that some stores are doing exactly that. At the 7-Elevens you had to pay NT\$1 (the New Taiwanese dollar is roughly equivalent to the Thai baht) if you wanted a plastic bag to carry your purchases in. I bought one, kept it in my shoulderbag, and used it throughout my stay. It made me feel good to be an eco-friendly, love-the-planet green dude.

The Nerdwell plan for plastic

My friend Fardley Nerdwell approves this idea for Thailand and envisions the following scenario, which I present in his own words:

"Because of environmental concerns, we must limit the production of plastic bags and make people pay for them. A plastic bag should be a treasure to be cherished and used forever.

"In the future, people will purchase one plastic bag for their shopping and try to make it last as long as possible. Each bag will be stamped with the date of purchase. Prizes will be awarded annually to the shopper who can produce the oldest bag. In 2030, the prize for Environmental Hero(ine) of the Decade will be awarded to Mrs Emma Bollocks, age 95, who possesses a grungy and tattered plastic bag purchased in 2011.

"Slogans will be imprinted upon plastic bags to encourage green thinking: 'Go green, dude!' 'I'm keen on green!' 'One shopper, one bag!" 'I'm greener than you!' 'Don't be a bag wastrel!'







What's taking so long?

Thailand has a long history of public works projects that are fully completed and ready to serve the people, but then stand idle while the various forces involved squabble over division of the associated spoils.

Here in Phuket, we have two important projects that fall into this category, even though authorities in both cases had plenty of time to settle the issues that now prevent these facilities from opening.

The first of these is the new Phuket Provincial Bus Terminal on Thepkrasattri Rd southbound in Rassada [See news pages.]

Completion of the terminal, built at a cost of 128 million baht, was a milestone given the amount of time it took to become a reality.

The Phuket Land Transport Office had been aware for well over a decade that having scores of large inter-provincial buses lumbering through the narrow streets of Phuket Town to reach the old station was untenable, especially given ever-worsening traffic congestion in the town center.

When the station was finally completed and handed over to the Land Transport Department on December 4 last year, there was little of the pomp-and-circumstance that usually surrounds such an event.

Now, three months later, the facility remains deserted and neither Rassada Municipality nor the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO) are interested in operating it.

This strikes the *Gazette* as unusual. Such facilities – and the right to administer the many concessions that go along with them – are generally the types of projects local administrative bodies love to sink their teeth into.

But the powers-that-be in Rassada Municipality say they are 'not yet ready' to take over administration of the moribund station.

Even worse, the PPAO, which has shown real commitment to improving public transport with its 'pink bus' service in Phuket Town, is also reportedly not interested. As a result, it now appears Phuket will have to wait three more months, at the least, before the Land Transport Department opens the station under its own administration.

Even harder to explain is the situation on Ranong Road where the 167-million-baht Fresh Market that was completed early last year has been sitting idle for more than a year now.

Phuket City Municipality said throughout 2009 that they wanted to wait until 'everything was in order' before opening, but surely a year should be more than enough time to broker a solution to whatever impasse lies between the municipality and the vendors.

With such large amounts of taxpayers' money involved, the public deserves better better performance from its elected officials.



Patong's new top cop speaks



FIRST PERSON

New Kathu Police Superintendent Arayapan Pukbuakao knows his current assignment will not be an easy one. The 49-year-old native of Samut Sakhon will have to call on all his 24 years of experience to maintain law and order in Patong. After serving 17 years in Chumphon and five in Ranong, Col Arayapan

was transferred to Phuket two years ago. He last served as superintendent of Tung Tong Police, located just over the hill in Kathu. He took up his new post in Patong on February 16. Here he speaks with the *Gazette*'s Kitima Pornmongkhonwat about the challenges he faces.

never expected to become a policeman, but my personal circumstances at the time led me into this career – even though it wasn't really what I wanted to do. So I made a promise to myself from the beginning that I would never be boastful or take advantage of other people, qualities of bad police officers that I have never liked.

I was among many senior officers who wanted the position of Kathu Police Superintendent, so I put in a request for it two years ago. I was very surprised to learn that I had been selected, because I never really expected to get it. It has helped me to realize that if you work hard every day, your efforts will eventually be rewarded.

I think the position of Kathu Police Superintendent is a very challenging one, as Patong is one of the largest tourist destinations in Thailand and there are so many problems here to fix. I also know that if I don't do a good job here I won't hold the position for long; that's why I intend to do my very best. That being said, even if I do eventually get transferred against my will, I'll accept it. I can work anywhere, so I won't mind.

Patong has many problems that are very complicated and

have been in place for a long time, so solving them will not be easy. This is especially true for the tuktuks. I will probably need three months before we see positive results that benefit both tourists and tourism business operators.

As I have only been here two weeks, my first order of business will be getting to know the 165 officers under my command. I need to clean up the inside of my house before I can address the problems outside it.

Within one-and-a-half months, people entering Kathu Police Station will notice a new look and improved public services. We will have a better waiting area and the service counters will be more orderly than they are at present.

I agree with the governor's idea to make Patong a special nightlife entertainment zone that can stay open until very late for people who enjoy nightlife. Otherwise they will have no place to go after the bars close and will continue drinking on the beach or along roadsides, which is not good. I also agree with his idea of putting meters in all tuk-tuks and taxis. It could happen, but it won't be easy.

I will begin to solve Patong's problems with traffic and lack of public parking. I will have to end

the current one-way traffic system, which not only confuses people but is also in violation of current Thai traffic laws.

Before, Patong levied very high fines for traffic violations and these were assessed differently depending on whether the violator was Thai or foreign. I will look into that and make sure the same fines are levied on everyone. But my real focus will not be on arresting or fining violators, but on building discipline and respect for traffic laws among motorists.

I want to make sure Patong is safe for tourists and I intend to study and solve the problem of bars that overcharge their guests.

Soi Bangla is a walking street, so I want to make it nice. That is why I have already stopped those people who bring animals onto the soi so that tourists can have their picture taken with them. I am also co-operating with Patong Munici-pality in keeping the soi clean. I hope we can find a way to do away with the bad [sewage] smells there.

I am also talking with Patong Municipality about fixing traffic lights at intersections that have been out of order for a long time, as well as installing more CCTV cameras to help police deal with traffic and crime.

My working style is people and community oriented, so I have to walk among the people and get to know them first and get the information I need. This is especially true of influential figures who employ gunmen for protection. I will talk to them, explaining that having armed guards only increases the possibility of violence, and tell them they have to disarm. If they have a valid reason for needing armed gunmen for protection they will have to come and see me first and ex-

plain the reason.

As I have been given this chance, I will try my best. I hope things will start to change in three months' time.

Trailers and sidecars are normally illegal. The police can stop you any time if you are using one.

If you really want to use a trailer you have to find a company with an engineer who can check the rig for safety and produce a certifying document. Then you can come to the Technical Transportation Section of our office to register the trailer.

FC Phuket rallies for first home win

FC Phuket 3, **Nakhon Sri** Thammarat 1

C Phuket recorded an historic first ever win at the Surakul Stadium last Sunday. The team, who failed to win a single home game in their debut season last year, defeated Nakhon Sri Thammarat 3-1 with two dramatic late goals.

The first home match against Pattalung was a disappointing scoreless draw. The second game of the season, away to newly formed Phang Nga, also ended in a draw. Nakhon Sri Thammarat then went into Sunday's game hoping for a repeat of last year's success when they beat FC Phuket 4-3.

Phuket FC, however, reinforced by the return of Ivory Coast midfielder Ali Diarra and the arrival of Thailand under-19 international Adisak, is an entirely different team this season. The Mighty 'Sea Kirin', as they now wish to be known, dominated the match from start to finish.

Ali Diarra provided some much needed steel in the middle of the park and his inclusion meant that playmaker Japan, ab-

sent due to sickness, was hardly missed. Diarra was continually able to find time and space and provided the impetus for a commanding first half performance.

Adisak's inclusion at the expense of Anurak, who has long been regarded as the best footballer in Phuket but has seldom impressed in FC Phuket colors, demonstrated that new coach Arjhan Songgamsub is more interested in ability than reputation.

The teenage Adisak, who has arrived on loan from Muang Thong Utd, justified his manager's faith in him when he twisted to head in a cross from an improbable angle in the 30th minute.

When the fourth official held up his board to indicate there would be one minute of added time in the first half, FC Phuket appeared destined to head into the interval with a one-goal lead, but the referee stunned the home supporters by awarding a penalty to Nakhon Sri Thammarat. The visitors seized the opportunity to tie the score as the clock winded down for halftime.

FC Phuket continued to dominate play in the second half, as their opponents struggled to keep possession, but were unable to regain any of their first half fluidity and failed to convert their superior possession into any points on the scoreboard.

Another disappointing day at Surakul Stadium seemed imminent when the 85th minute cross was flicked on and fell at the feet of Adisak, who calmly sidestepped the ball, beyond Nakhon Sri Thammarat's keeper. With minutes remaining, Nakhon Sri Thammarat responded by throwing men forward in search of an equalizer, but FC Phuket were able to capitalize with a counter attack, culminating with substitute Nitirol applying a simple finish.

FC Phuket Coach Arjhan Songgamsub was delighted with the performance and in particular by the impact of the new signing.

"Adisak did very well and I was pleased with him scoring two goals. Nakhon Sri Thammarat beat Chumpon last week but we were much better than them today. I'm happy have won a game in Phuket at last," he said.

In this third and final Golf Guru piece, I'll talk about the practical dimensions of the game: choosing the right club, the preshot routine, and the age old advice of keeping your head down.

Customizing your clubs

I have clients who have rated their golfing season by how many shafts they bent or snapped in frustration. One particular golfer managed eight shafts in one year. He improved his game the next year, and only had to replace six shafts.

Most single-figure handicap golfers understand the specifications of their golf clubs, however, some players I see for the first time use golf clubs that don't fit them. The club head might be too upright or sit too flat on the ground. The shaft flex might be an incorrect speed for their swing or the golf grips might be the wrong size.

Good news for frustrated golfers: all of these problems are the club's fault, not yours.

When perfecting a swing, it's important to remember to let the club do the work. It's not what can you do for your clubs, it's what your clubs can do for you.

Fitted golf clubs can give your golf game an extra edge, so understanding how to customize them will help you find your true potential as a golfer. With well fitted clubs, your brain can send the right messages to your body, allowing you to fulfil your true potential as a golfer.

This requires someone with experience as a golf coach who can watch your swing and determine what's best. Once you've got the right equipment, the clubs are not just a lethal weapon that you hurl high into the sky in frustration or objects to be broken so you can fit them in your bag easier.

The pre-shot routine

Every golf player should go through a consistent pre-shot routine before they hit the ball.

What does that mean?

In a nutshell, it means practicing enough that you do the same thing every time before you hit the ball. This helps you to relax so your body can flow with the swing.

Golf needs to played by the abstract part of your mind, which means you should try to picture the shot before you play. When you do that, your mind shouldn't be thinking about words, but the look and feel of your swing. See it and do it! The analytical part of the mind is the part you use to learn how to play golf; once this is done, then you must trust what you have learned and play golf out of habit. No second guessing.

So, select your golf club and think of the best shot you have ever hit with that particular club, and remember to hit the ball all in one movement.

For me, when I move into my pre-shot routine, it takes 8.7 seconds from start to finish.

After that, I am watching my ball fly to the target, if I take any longer or shorter I am out of my comfort zone.

Keep your head down

The most common saying in golf, apart from 'give me my next putt', is 'keep your head down'.

This phrase is especially popular after topping a shot along the ground (politely called a daisy cutter, or impolitely called a worm shagger) or swinging and missing the ball completely.

But what does it mean to keep your head down?

Most beginners have a tendency to look up before their club actually comes in contact with a ball. Try considering this routine in order get the most out of this universal quip of golf advice: Keep your head up in line with the angle of your spine and your eyes down.

This is one of the best-kept secrets in golf. Doing this will allow your shoulders to swing more freely around your head, stopping your head from jerking up before your swing comes in contact with the ball.

It might feel awkward at first, but with practice, it will eventually feel comfortable.


Last but not least, even the most well-read 'golf guru' will not be much of a player if he doesn't hit the course. Reading for improvement can help with the broad picture, but save the finer details for when you're actually playing. So grab your clubs and head out for some practice!



Fair Play League rounds up with runaway winner

Now for the tomatoes: If our friend cannot find the

seed (both the aforementioned shops have at least two varieties) then why not sunpotted singly in small pots – most nurser- dry an overripe tomato and use the seeds?

I see no reason why this should not work. After all, it works with most seed-producing plants. And it will save you a few baht.

However, there are certain advantages in using packet seeds. You can be guaranteed a high rate of germination -50 to 80% - and an end result that is true to the picture on the front of the envelope. Moreover, you may be able to buy better strains, or more exotic varieties.

Let me give you some examples. Yesterday I obtained some flower seeds from Phuket Town. I was able to buy not only the blue ipomoea (morning glory to most of us), but a deep red and, I believe, more unusual variety.

Also acquired were different cultivars of annuals and perennials already established in the garden. One was a packet of assorted vinca (periwinkle), in shades of red as well as the usual white and pink; another acquisition was a variety of scarlet flowering gomphrena, quite different in color from the magenta annuals that normally appear in Thai gardens.

And I found some newer zinnia cultivars, striking double varieties in both white and red. I had been enthused to see these flowering at the Royal Project, a research center on the slopes of Doi Inthanon in Chaing Mai. I hope they will do as well in the less forgiving environment of Phuket.

Another question was about soil conditioner or amendments. As we all know, the top-soil here is scanty and the subsoil not only lacking in nutrients, but dense and unworkable when dry. Lime would help to break down this sub-soil, but it is as well to remember that most plots here are already alkaline on account of all the builders' debris – especially cement run-off – that has found its way into the surrounding ground. It was certainly the case with my land.

I suggest two or three possible expedients. If you are short on fertile topsoil, lash out on a cubic meter or two. It can be ordered from some garden centers, already bagged. I recently did a deal with the driver of a mechanical digger who was clearing the top-soil prior to digging

> footings for a house. After I had waved two hundred baht at him, he promptly dumped a load in the back of my pick-up.


If that sounds too much like hard work, you can buy large bags of coconut fiber – the fine stuff that exists in heaps at the rear of many garden centers.


Local nurserymen often mix it with ordinary soil to create a potting medium.

You can use a similar strategy by forking the light-weight fiber into your flower beds, so as to improve the friability and texture of the ground. It acts in much the same way as sphagnum or moss peat – familiar to most farangs: it improves the structure of the soil, enhances its capacity to hold moisture and maybe helps to counter excessive alkalinity.

If you want to get more technical and money is no object, you can use vermiculite to dramatically improve water retention, or gypsum to help release nutrients and improve the soil's consistency.

But if you are feeling really weary, those ubiquitous bags of compost can be used in much the same way.





Buying a property with existing management

have become popular for property buyers in recent years. Management services such as security, gardening, and pool keeping all permit buyers to fully enjoy their property with peace of mind.

Whenever buying a unit in a managed property development, a buyer should turn attention to the management agreements between the project manager and the project owners. Careful review of such agreements is unfortuantely often disregarded, as most buyers usually focus on the sale itself or lease rights to the chosen unit.

This mistake could have serious impact on an investment, as proper management and transparency regarding use of occuring management fees is of highest importance, not only in regard to succesful operation of a property, but also with the resale of a property.

Typically, a management agreement should include a provision clearly describing the services to be provided by the management of a project. Furthermore, the scope of such services should be outlined. This should help to prevent any dispute between buyers and the management at later date.

In addition, a sound management agreement should be willing to provide the costs of the management, including all services provided under that management.

anaged property developments Typically, each buyer has to pay a proportionate split of the total expense, calculated on a basis of total area occupied by an owner. In this regard, it should also be clarfied that the manager must have a right to reasonably increase the management fees in order to ensure that suffient funds are available to cope with increasing costs for the provided services.

A management agreement should also include provisions giving the manager the right to collect funds to be paid into a sinking fund. Sinking funds are required to provide management with sufficient finances – to be exclusively used – to pay for major repair works and maintenance of the common areas in a development.

Buyers should understand that maintenance of sinking funds is in fact necessary to ensure long-term enjoyment of a project. Properties with poorly managed and neglected common areas hardly qualify

Also keep in mind that transparency of expenses regarding the funds of a sinking fund is of the highest importance. Management should always be willing to reveal them upon request. It is the responsibility of management to maintain accounts and keep records in accordance with generally accepted audit principles, as well as provide annual statements to buyers, documenting the usage of all expenses.

Finally, a management agreement should provide a clearly defined recourse

in case management falls into a breach of contract. Such a recourse should be part of a carefully drafted default provision, whereunder buyers have a right to terminate the appointed management of a project and/or appoint a third party management company to provide the required services.

In summary, whenever investing in a managed property development, buyers should carefully review all provided sales and marketing documentation, including all agreements to be signed, potential risks, and susequent damages that could occur from poor management of a project. This should be routine practice for anyone interested in buying a managed property in Thailand.


4. Malaiwana Luxury Apartments
