

# Lovers leap 17 floors to death

YOUNG couple jumped to their deaths from a Patong condo in the early morning of March 7 after their parents disapproved of the relationship.

Anon Phawalaksanawat, 26, and Atachima 'Wan' Onkaow, 24, traveled to the island for a last holiday together before their planned suicides.

The two Bangkok residents were identified from documents left in a 17th-floor room at the Patong Tower on Thaweewong Road.

Police found the room's lights, television and airconditioning left on and the balcony door open.

The couple had jumped off a wooden box found stacked on a table next to the balcony railing.

Police also found five letters addressed to family members.

In one of them Miss

Atachima apologized to her family, saying the couple had decided to come to Phuket for a final holiday before killing themselves because of her family's disapproval of their relationship.

The young lovers had been renting the room since March 5.

Before their deaths, they arranged their possessions in pairs and left a photograph album containing pictures of them at Phuket tourist attractions.

The bodies were found by a security guard at around 5:30am. The condo's CCTV system showed they jumped at 5:24am.

There was no sign of a struggle.

Police are treating the deaths as suicide.

### Tsunami buoys on the way

HE DIRECTOR of the National Disaster Warning Center says two more tsunami buoys will be deployed off the Andaman Coast by year-end.

NDWC Director Viriya Mongkolveerapan said the government is spending more than 100 million baht on the tsunami detection units, which are on order from Italy.

One will be deployed about 10 to 20km off the coast of Phuket and the other a similar distance from Ranong, he said.

Last December the NDWC replaced the single existing direct detection buoy, anchored to the sea bottom about 600 nautical miles northwest of Phuket.

The 'Dart II' unit, deployed in December 2006, was gifted to Thailand by the US government under the stipulation that the NDWC would be responsible for its routine maintenance, including an annual change of battery.

Due to bureaucratic obstacles, the NDWC never changed the battery. Last September the buoy finally stopped transmitting, leaving Thailand with no direct detection capacity for over three months.

The switch-out was finally made and the new unit began transmitting data in December, just in time for the fifth anniversary of the tsunami disaster.

# Camp extortion scam uncovered

MAN posing as a government official was arrested on March 3 for extorting money from Burmese construction workers' camps.

Making the arrest was Thammarong Chuy-aksorn, deputy chief administrative officer of Thalang District, who led a team of 14 undercover officers to carry out a sting operation at the camp.

Mr Thammarong said the action followed complaints from construction project supervisors on the island, mostly in Thalang.

The supervisors said a man calling himself 'Inspector M' and claiming to be a government officer was extorting money from the camps by promising not to report the presence of unregistered Burmese workers in exchange for cash payoffs.

The man, who allegedly brandished a .45 handgun to intimidate people, claimed he was under orders to conduct a survey of alien workers for the National Intelligence Agency.

The camp where the man's extortion campaign ended is on the site of a large residential estate project by a large Bangkok-based development company off Thepkrasattri Road in Thalang.

The man first approached the project foreman on February 28.

He reported the extortion attempt to the Phuket Governor's complaints department, which asked the Thalang District Security Division to apprehend the man and bring him in for police questioning.

The foreman arranged to meet the man to pay a bribe of 1,000 baht at the site at 3pm.

When 'Inspector M' arrived, Mr Thammarong's men were in the camp disguised as construction workers.

After the foreman handed over the money, the team moved in and arrested 'Inspector M' without a struggle.

Inspector M was later identified as Somrit Patanon, a 47-year-old resident of Cherng Talay.

A search of his person uncovered a picture ID badge with the logo of the Internal Security Operations Command (Isoc), a .45-caliber pistol, a sound recording device, a pair of handcuffs, a digital camera, a police radio, a notebook containing lists of construction sites, and many more items.

Mr Somrit confessed to charges of impersonating a government officer, but denied using threatening behavior.

He claimed he was just the bag man for a high ranking district officer and a village headman who were behind the racket.

Mr Thammarong and his men escorted Mr Somrit to Thalang Police Station for questioning.

The scam is not the first of its kind in Phuket.

There was a spate of extortion attempts at Burmese labor camps in 2008, including one that ended in murder.

### Fatality at water plant

N EMPLOYEE at a desalination plant in Karon died on March 3 when he was sucked into a high pressure intake hose at the facility.

The worker, 40-year-old Tannit Pramungij, accidentally fell into a large vessel containing sea water while performing maintenance at the REQ Water Services plant about 2:30pm on March 2.

Mr Tannit was sucked into a 30-meter length of high pressure intake hose connected to the tank, used to force saltwater though the reverse-osmosis membrane tubes.

Colleagues rushed to free him, but he emerged unconscious and with a very low pulse.

He was taken to Patong Hospital, where he later died.

#### 'DJ Nat' dies

DJ at the popular Boat Bar in Patong was found dead in his bedroom above the venue on March 3.

Police believe 35-year-old Ratchanon Bawonsakulchart, known as 'DJ Nat', died of chronic health problems.

Colleagues found Mr Ratchanon dead on his bedroom floor at around 8pm.

Boat Bar, located on the access road to the Royal Paradise Hotel, is one of many venues in the area that cater to gay tourists.

Kathu Police Inspector Sophon Borrirak said there were no signs of foul play or robbery at the scene, on the fourth floor of the building.

An examination at Patong Hospital suggested Mr Ratchanon suffered from diabetes, asthma and high blood pressure, in addition to being overweight.







### Red shirts: 'We won't burn our own home'

red shirts left the island on March 11 to take part in mass demonstrations in Bangkok.

A local leader of the redshirt United Front of Democracy Against Dictatorship (UDD) movement, Soonthorn Tohmharn, said there would be no demonstrations in Phuket.

At the time of going to press, a huge UDD protest in Bangkok was set to take place on the afternoon of March 12 in a last ditch effort to topple Prime Minister

NE thousand local Abhisit Vejjajiva's government.

The planned protests were expected to draw hundreds of thousands of red shirts from around the country.

PM Abhisit said the Internal Security Act would be imposed to deal with the protests.

"I hope we don't need to impose martial law," he said.

Mr Soonthorn insisted there would be no violence in Phuket.

"We are not going to burn our own home," he said. "We are aware of what we should and shouldn't do," he added.

"All red shirts are following their heart to capital," he said.

Phuket City Police Acting Superintendent Chaiwat Auykham said he was not worried about red-shirt protests in Phuket. However, he expected a hike in criminal activity to coincide with the Bangkok demonstrations.

"I have ordered local police to make hourly checks, especially on politicians and government buildings such as the Phuket Provincial Court, to ensure safety and order," he said.

Representatives from Phuket's yellow-shirted People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) said on March 10 they urged all political group members to refrain from violence.

Phuket PAD leader Soonthorn Rakrong said his members would not attempt to stop red-shirt protests in the South.

He added, however, that due to the large number of yellow shirts in the region, the leadership would not be able to exert complete control over the situation.

### Supercheap strangler cuffed at checkpoint

OLICE have arrested a man wanted for the rape and strangling murder of 24-year-old Supercheap employee Thipkasen 'Khwan' Heep-phech last month.

Nakhon Sri Thammarat native Sutthiporn 'Khao' Morasin was arrested as he tried to leave the island at Tah Chat Chai checkpoint on March 6.

Witnesses told police Mr Sutthiporn, 25, lived next door to Miss Khwan at the Laem Hin Home apartment block in Koh Kaew.

He was wanted for questioning in the case soon after Miss Khwan's body was found in her room on February 24.

Witnesses told police Mr Sutthiporn and his victim had been in a relationship that soured for financial reasons.

Mr Sutthiporn denies all charges.

### Smugglers netted

OUR Rawai fishermen were arrested on March 7 for smuggling protected marine species.

The suspects, 34-year-old Pichit Bangjak and three minors, were arrested at 11am in a pickup truck parked along Thepkrasattri Road in Rassada.

A search of foam coolers in the bed of the truck uncovered 250 aquarium fish, 300 corals and 20 sea fans ready for transport in plastic bags and other types of packaging.

The value of the items was estimated in excess of 200,000 baht.

The arrests followed a report that men in a truck would be loading protected species onto a Bangkok-bound tour bus leaving the Phuket Bus Terminal in Phuket Town at 10:50am.

The operation was led jointly by Phuket Marine and Coastal Resources Conservation Center Director Paitoon Panchaipum and Phuket Marine Police Deputy Inspector Natthapong Preugtharathikul.

The officers followed the P2 company bus out of the station to Rassada, where the men were waiting to flag down the vehicle and load the containers into the storage hold.

The suspects confessed to transporting the items, but insisted that the marine life did not belong to them and that they were simply acting as handlers.

All four suspects were taken to Phuket City Police Station and charged with possession of protected species without permission.

Police will try to expand the investigation and bring more fish and coral smugglers to justice.

Mr Paitoon said there are still 28 fishing boats operating



ES BIRD's teeth are clenched, muscles taut and body drenched in sweat as he sprints the last leg of his hour-long training hike to the summit of Nakkerd Hill in Chalong.

As he heaves off his 40 kilogram bag and glances at his watch, Les scolds himself for finishing his training hike in under an hour.

"I need to slow down; I'm going to buy ankle weights today. That will stop me running," the 10-year Phuket resident says.

In the thirty degree heat atop Phuket's highest peak, Les shivers. He knows he has a monolithic challenge ahead: a climb 14 times the height of the 350-meter Nakkerd Hill – and just a few degrees colder.

#### A treacherous climb

Mont Blanc, or the White Mountain, bestrides the French and Italian borders and is one of the world's deadliest climbs. Each year, at least a dozen climbers die trying to reach the 4,810-meter (15,781 foot) summit.

Glaciologists and climbing experts warn that falling seracs, or ice shelves, resulting in avalanches are a threat often ignored by the 20,000 climbers in the summer season, from June to August, every year.

Both Italian and French rescue teams deal with up to 800 emergency calls a day in this period.

Les, however, with only three years' climbing experience gained 40 years ago in his native England, says he will be well prepared for the climb.

He will be climbing in a

two-man team with fellow Brit Harry Taylor.

A former Special Air Service (SAS) soldier, Taylor was the first man to traverse the Pinnacles, on the Northeast Ridge of Mount Everest in 1988.

"Climbing at five kilometers above sea level in crampons in sub zero temperatures will be extremely demanding for Les," Taylor said.

The pair plan to take the feared Peuterey Integral route, one of the longest and technically difficult summit traverses in the Alpine region, where 75 mph icy winds and temperatures of minus 20 make for treacherous climbing.

Les will arrive in the Alpine resort of Chamonix Valley a month prior to the July 4 climb. There, he will have three weeks of mountain training, including an Avalanche Awareness Course.

He will also practice sliding down mountain slopes at speed, careening onto his side and using his ice axe as an emergency brake.

"Altitude sickness, hypothermia and exhaustion are all dangers, but slipping is my biggest fear. Even experienced climbers have slipped on Mont Blanc, been unable to stop and fallen to their deaths in crevasses," he said.

It will take the duo eight days to reach the summit.

Over the first three days, the pair will make ascents to 1,500, 2,000 and 3,500 meters, descending back down the mountain after each climb.

On day four, they intend to climb 4,000 meters, camp for the night, and again descend to the Chamonix Valley.

On the sixth day, they plan to reach the 4,810 meter summit, plant the Thai national flag at the top and then make the precipitous descent the next day.

"Your body has to get used to operating with less oxygen, so when you go up on the final two-day climb to the summit, the amount of oxygen in your blood is sufficient for you to function," he said.

"If a person attempted to do the climb on the first day, unless they were superhuman they would be in dire trouble," he added.

#### Phuket support

As Les stoops into a delapidated classroom in Phuket Town, 40 little faces look skyward mouths agape. At six feet four inches he must look like a giant to the students under the care of the Child Watch Phuket foundation.

The classroom is a stone's throw from Phuket Provincial Prison, where most of these children's parents are being detained.

One little boy eyes the visitor's size 14 running shoes, while others stare at his T-shirt which is emblazoned with iron man competition logos.

Through his Mont Blanc challenge, Les hopes to raise one million baht for impoverished, orphaned and abused children cared for by the foundation

Since 1998 the foundation has helped over 1,500 children with education scholarships, day care services and shelter at the Phuket Town and Kathu based centers

"If Phuket people would be so generous as to donate to my Alpine adventure, the funds will go to a very just cause," Les said.

#### The Ironman

'Fanatical' is how Les describes his Alpine training

On Mondays he opts for a spot of ocean swimming: four kilometers from Bang Tao Beach to Koh Waeo Island.

A safety boat tails him to help avoid long tail fishing boats. "They wouldn't expect to see a swimmer so far out," says Les.

Three times a week, he cycles 125 kilometers wearing a weight belt. He endures three-hour runs and day-long hikes up Nakkerd Hill. He is a man who takes pleasure in pain.

"My friends stopped training with me years ago. They say I'm no fun," he says of his tendency to use a heart rate monitor, and stopwatch when running, hiking, swimming and cycling.

Les has competed in seven Ironman competitions around the world over the past 10

Consisting of a grueling 3.8-kilometer swim, 180-kilometer





cycle and a 42.2 kilometer marathon, Ironman competitions are revered as the toughest triathlons on the planet.

In November last year at the World Ironman 70.3 Championships in Florida, Les represented Britain after winning the 50-59 age group in Ironman Singapore 2009.

His first competitive athletic outing came at the China Coast Marathon on his 40th birthday.

After a decade of marathon running throughout South East Asia, he moved to Phuket a week prior to his 50th birthday, and a few days before the Laguna Phuket Triathalon, which he entered.

But even superfit Les knows his Alpine climb demands a different style of training.

The deleterious effects on his body due to altitude sickness are also a concern.

"A person can be a world class athlete at sea level but become a vegetable at 4,000 meters," he says.

When asked why he would want to put himself through this personal anguish, he replies: "I have to do it. I don't want to look back in five years and realize I missed my window."

#### In the line of fire

As former Royal Hong Kong Police (RHKP) Commander Les served 21 years (1976-1997) in a profession synonymous with danger.

He's been shot at by drug traffickers, lost close friends in the line of duty, and was involved in one of the most successful international narcotics operations in RHKP's history.

The 1989 operation resulted in 24 arrests and the seizing of 43 kilograms of heroin in what amounted to the complete dismantling of an international drug smuggling racket.

"In the late '80s I was in charge of the marine counter terrorism unit and the counter piracy unit...It was a very physically demanding job. Everyone in the unit was scarily fit," he said.



### **Eco-plan sustained for Krabi**

SUSTAINABLE tourism has been the buzz phrase in the tourist industry for a while now, but a recent event in Krabi proved that both tourist operators and travelers consider it more than just a passing trend.

Rayavadee Resort hosted the Phranang - Railay Sustainable Tourism Development Project on March 9 and 10. The event's aim was not only to promote conservation and protection of the local surroundings and culture from the detrimental effects of tourism, but develop a model which can be used throughout the Kingdom.

Having learned from neighboring Phuket's misguided moves early on in the game, Krabi is aware of the importance of guarding its rich heritage, deep rooted culture and outstanding natural beauty from mismanaged tourism.

Rayavadee Resort has been instrumental in developing and promoting sustainable tourism on the Phranang – Railay peninsula. The premier five star resort, which spans 26 acres, recycles both waste water and garbage.

Rayavadee's Chief Designer, Khun Garnchai explained, "The water recycling system ensures that waste water does not contaminate the sea. The recycled water is used for flushing toilets and watering the plants, which reduces the resort's overall water usage."

The resort also recycles waste materials from the kitchen and garden to produce an organic fertilizer. By recycling waste, Rayavadee not only reduces the



amount of rubbish, but creates an effective soil regenerative.

The resort's annual mangrove planting involves schoolchildren, visitors and local government representatives anchoring new plant life in this important ecosystem. Aside from restoring nature, this initiative cultivates an environmental consciousness in the local community. By donating floating buoys, the resort also hopes to prevent further damage to the sea bed due to longtail anchors.

### Living in taxing times

but the clerk provides some formula that would leave an Oxford math PhD baffled.

'Just pay 100,000 baht!', would be the reply from the clerk.

Since only paying 22,000 baht in tax the year before, this random increase has left taxpayers feeling stunned and angry.

Through written complaints and negotiations, one could argue their way to a settlement of 45,000 baht, and feel relieved that the tax was only raised by 100%.

Recently, there have been some new and shocking tax rates announced, which will effect a broad spectrum of business owners.

First announced was a swimming pool tax. Yes, that's right, folks. Hotels will be taxed for the size of their swimming pool. And if that is not enough, there will be a restaurant tax imposed, as well.

Add these new taxes to the hotel tax, building and structure tax, VAT tax, social security tax, salary tax and we are fast becoming like another over-taxed westernized country.

Although fighting with the taxman is nothing new, I think it is best described in the Beatles song *Taxman*:

"If you drive a car, I'll tax the street. If you try to sit, I'll tax your seat. If you get too cold, I'll tax the heat. If you take a walk, I'll tax your feet.'

A faster way to raise taxes, rather then burden legitimate businesses, would be to create a special tax on tailor shops. They outnumber every other business in Krabi by a wide margin and hire few or no Thai staff.

How about a tax on street

Or tax on the street vendors that clog the sidewalks with their wares, annoying tourists and disrupting legitimate businesses?

The underlying theme for those dreaming up new taxes should be: raise taxes on the things which there are too many of and give a break to the other businesses that enhance the value of Krabi.

### Parents outraged over teachers' magic potion

BURIRAM: Parents are up in arms after teachers at a government school tried to use black magic to find out which of their pupils stole money from a staff member on March 2.

Children complained they were made to swear they didn't take the cash, then drink 'magic water' from a bottle containing various

Saithong Khareram, a local village chief, said parents claimed three teachers at Ban Nong Trat School used unacceptable means to find the child who had stolen 800 baht from one of them.

After no child admitted to the theft, the teachers fetched a bottle of 'magic water' made by a local monk, Mr Saithong said.

The water contained old nails, marbles, toothpicks, human hair, leaves and rubber bands.

The teachers forced the children to drink the concoction and swear they didn't steal the money.

Many of the children agreed to the test, though others refused, rendering the trial useless.

After hearing what happened, parents were furious that the teachers made their children drink such a potentially dangerous concoction.

quarrelled over whose turn it was with the knife and Phra Sathien reportedly slipped, falling knifefirst into Phra Sunantha.

This time the amulet failed and the knife went deep into the monk's chest.

They rushed Phra Sunantha to hospital but doctors were unable to save him.

Police have charged Phra Sathien with murder.

### Khanasutra's perfect culinary caravan



s anyone who has ever read Henri Charriere's Papillon will testify, it's maddening to be forever sifting through the book, sorting out what's true or shameless male chest beating. Although the story is riveting, one can't help but wondering how heady the mixture of fact and fiction is.

But think about the sensory onslaught of literature, celluloid and cultural influences that the subcontinent churns out and, more importantly, think about just how long it's been since you've indulged in a good Indian culinary blowout.

'You can't curry love' Phil Collins should have sang, so due preparations were patiently made, diplomatic passes ensured, pack camels packed and the Wilkos stalked up, much to the astonishment of the Chinese New Year revelers, over to Khanasutra Indian restaurant on Phuket Town's Takuapa Road.

References to the nomadic

priate as the one-room restaurant cushions and ample horizontal is alive in swathes of vividly dyed Pasha spaces in which to lie



down. We, being ramrod-backed Anglo Saxons, however, choose to sit at table and absorb the atmosphere at what must be one of the most exotic restaurants in Phuket Town.

Indian-tinged contemporary music gushes and swirls in and out of the pillars as a waitress lights wall and table candles, and the restaurant comes alive in a kaleidoscope of glittering figurines and faux wall vines.

Those looking for the erotic side of things will no doubt associate the restaurant's name with the Indian love manual the Kamasutra and get all giggly, but in fact 'Khanasutra' is the North Indian dialect for 'food'.

Speaking of which, we kick off with veggie samosas priced at 120 baht, veggie pakora for 80 baht, before launching into a fish, then a spinach-and-chicken masala – both 250 baht.

It's all excellent stuff and a real change from the lighter yet more polemical Thai cuisine. The fish comes out the best with a wonderful texture and taste.

The samosas were deliv-

ered handsomely, and of course, we had a selection of nan bread – priced at 60 baht for plain and 80 baht for garlic butter – to accompany the main dishes.

To wash all this down we enjoyed a few glasses of the excellent South African house wine at 180 baht.

The restaurant throws a curry buffet every second Sunday of the month at which diners can indulge in a varied set menu at a very reasonable price.

Owner Billy Chima is one of Phuket Town's 'original' characters and is responsible for quite a few football-related events on the island. If you are an Arsenal footbball club supporter, waste no time in getting on down there if a game is on - you'll be in very good company.

Khanasutra is located at 18-20 Takua Pa Road, off Rasada Road, in Phuket Town. Open for lunch Monday to Saturday 11am to 3pm and dinner 6pm to 10:30pm, or till the last customer leaves. On Sundays, Khanasutra is open for dinner from 6pm to 10:30pm. Closed on Tuesdays.



### Relics promote peace





aking its Phuket debut, a collection of holy relics, believed to be from the historical Buddha and many other Buddhist's masters, was on display last weekend at the Karuna Meditation and Yoga Center in Kamala.

Throughout the two-day special event, several hundred Thai and western visitors viewed a rare collection of over 1,000 venerated relics.

Buddhists believe these relics, which resemble pearl-like crystals, are found after cremation and are produced as a result of the master's spiritual qualities of compassion and wisdom.

For Friday's pre-viewing event, the center hosted a small private audience of local monks,





worshipers, volunteers and media to celebrate the relic tour's arrival in Phuket.

The ceremony was presided over by Phuket's head monk Pra Ajarn Wisuthi Dharmakanee who talked with audience members and lead many prayers and chants.

Both Pra Ajarn Wisuthi Dharmakanee and Pra Ajarn Vorasak Varadhammo made brief presentations on the Metta and its aspects of friendship, benevolence and loving kindness.

Although the viewing event was free to the public, 25,000 baht was collected in donations which will benefit the Maitreya Heart Shrine Project's many community initiatives in Kushinagar, India.

Long term planning includes the construction of a 500-foot bronze statue of Buddha, along with a park, exhibition hall, museum and library.

benefit. Anxiety relating to dental treatment is common, but in a well-prepared dental office, there are ways to deal with this problem. One of the safest, most effective and pleasant choices is nitrous oxide sedation.

Nicknamed 'laughing gas' for it euphoric effects, Nitrous oxide is used in dentistry to induce sedation and put patients in a calm, dreamy state who would otherwise be nervous and unable to co-operate.

I have never undergone nitrous sedation myself, so I don't have first-hand experience to share with you, but thanks to years in the trade, I don't get nervous about being jabbed in the mouth. However, my patients have told me they felt relaxed and half awake, like dreaming, and that time appeared to pass quickly. Some had tingling sensations in their arms and legs. All were conscious and aware of what was going on but were detached, distracted, and could not concentrate on the fear.

In high doses, laughing gas has analgesic qualities and acts like a weak general anesthetic. In dentistry, nitrous oxide is used in relatively low doses as a blended nitrous oxide/oxygen formula, only for sedation and raising the pain threshold. The general ratio is 30:70 to 50:50 nitrous oxide/oxygen, which is controlled by a flowmeter. Local anesthetics, such as lidocaine, are administered to numb the nerves.

Nitrous oxide is colorless, non-flammable and has a pleasant, slightly sweet odor and taste. Dentists deliver nitrous oxide/oxygen to patients through a fitted mask placed over the nose and ask the patients to breathe normally. Uptake occurs through the lungs. At the end of treatment, it is eliminated from the blood system after a short period (about five minutes) of breathing pure oxygen, and all the effects of sedation are reversed. Unlike IV sedation or general anesthesia, patients can leave the office almost immediately by themselves, without an escort.

Nitrous oxide/oxygen is perhaps the safest sedative in dentistry. It is well tolerated, has a rapid onset, is reversible, can be adjusted in various concentrations and is non-allergenic. Patients remain conscious, keep all their natural reflexes and are capable of responding to questions or requests, making it suitable for adults and children alike. Additionally, it works well for patients whose gag reflex interferes with dental treatment.




Nitrous oxide (laughing gas) takes the stress and pain out of a trip to the dentist. It puts patients in a dreamy state and makes them unable to focus on fear. However, a small percentage of patients are not affected by the gas.

Nitrous oxide has few side effects. High doses can cause nausea in some patients, and about 10 percent of patients do not benefit from it. Patients who are not comfortable wearing a nasal mask or have nasal congestion cannot use nitrous oxide/oxygen effectively. Patients with severe anxiety may need laughing gas in conjunction with other sedative agents. In dental literature there have been reports that a small number of patients experienced hallucinations instead of euphoria, which may be related to the dosage.

If you are worried by the sights, sounds or sensations of dental treatment, nitrous oxide/oxygen sedation may be an alternative for you. In this sense, Happy Dentistry is dental euphoria for the patients and euphoric dentistry for the dentists.


Although based out of the nearby Koh Samui, Ritchie travels over to Phuket for his show because of the island's constant high tourist volume and enthusiastic crowds.

Mick Kealy is well known and was the America's Cup and the Australia Bi-centennial in 1986." ever-growing yachting industry. He established Octopus Electrical Services, with offices at the Boat Lagoon, in 1997 and for the past three years has been the Commodore of the Ao Chalong Yacht Club.

He started life in Bunyip, Victoria, Australia, one in a family of eight children.

While still in school, he started a four year apprenticeship as an electrical mechanic with the State Electricity Commission and attended Yallorne Technical College. It was a challenging job as he repaired electrical systems in coal mines. He was assigned to assist in making sure that the mine's conveyor belts were maintained in good working condition.

In 1984, Mick was 22 years old and spent the next few years working and traveling around Australia and Southeast Asia.

"Those were some great years. I worked at a resort on Hayman Island in the Whitsunday island chain and then drove to Perth and worked in Kalgoorlie. I was able to save enough money to travel around Indonesia and Thailand.

"I flew back to Darwin and then drove all the way across Australia to Melbourne and then headed west to Perth where it

Mick was working in Perth wiring computer systems when he received a call from his brother who invited him to join a film project in Western Samoa.

"I flew to Western Samoa where my brother was working on a documentary about the early explorers on a hundred year old, 100 foot traditional sailing ship. It was my first sailing experience and opened a new world for me."

He began working on large sailing vessels in Fiji and the Philippines, doing the electrical installations on refits.

In the early 1990s, Mick found his version of paradise at the simple bungalows at Ao Sane Beach, a hidden enclave north of Nai Harn. With his VHF radio, he was able to alert the local yachties of his ability with marine electrical repairs and would windsurf to the boats to do the work.

Mick bought his first boat, Chelsea Morning, a 32 foot sloop with no engine, and entered the King's Cup Regatta in the cruising class. While making Phuket his base, he worked on a variety of boats as engineer. He then became the captain of the 60 foot Camper & Nicholson luxury yacht, Caryali.

"I took this yacht to San Remo, Italy and got to visit a lot

of incredible places like the Pyramids in Egypt, the shores of Sudan and the island of Rhodes."

Mick returned to Australia and worked in gold mines in Western Australia and the Northern Territories and earned enough to set up Octopus Electrical Services at the Boat Lagoon in 1997. He became the agent for many of the world's best brands of equipment for boats, including Ray Marine. He provides essential equipment like generators, water makers, battery chargers and inverters.


When the import duties on Thai registered boats were reduced several years ago, his business grew faster than expected and he found it challenging to cope with the demand.

"At one time I had 15 Thai electricians working with me on over 40 boats. It was very hectic and I decided to downsize our operation to something I could control. Now I focus on fault finding and prevention. I have a corps of excellent electricians that have been with me for many years."

Mick is now half owner of a 34 foot X yacht, Minx, which won in the first three Phuket Race Week competitions, in addition to a big win in the Langkawi Regatta and a second and a third in the King's Cup.

When not socializing with his mates at the Ao Chalong Yacht Club, he spends his happy hours sailing with son Liam and daughter Gemma.

Sailing the JSST course will give the children a great opportunity to improve their sailing skills and racing knowledge, as well as the chance to practice with a larger fleet. Arrangements are also being made for them to stay on for further practice

before competing in Nationals.

The cost of sending the children to the Advanced Optimist training camp and the Gulf Regatta is estimated at approximately 100,000 baht, including accommodation, food, course fees, boat charter, entry fees and transportation.

Travel arrangements, however, have not been confirmed due to the fact they are looking at various low cost and sponsorship options, including sponsored flights from Phuket to Bangkok.

### Balancing the imagination deficit

mbarking on a soulsearching adventure, a young Alan Wallace left behind the good life of his suburban Southern Californian upbringing and bought a one-way ticket to self-imposed poverty on the other side of the world.

He bade farewell to an attractive, intelligent girlfriend, turned his back on his straight-As higher education and began studying Tibetan Buddhism in India.

Two decades later, the dynamic lecturer, progressive scholar and one of the most prolific western writers and translators of Tibetan Buddhism, including ancient medical texts, Alan Wallace (Ph.D) is on a mission to integrate Buddhist contemplative practices with Western science to advance the study of the mind.

Today, equipped with a degree in physics and the philosophy of science, and having been ordained by H.H. Dalai Lama, Alan Wallace is president and founder of the Santa Barbara Institute for Consciousness Studies. Last year, his 'job' took him on a 200,000-mile tour of the globe, attending conferences, conducting lectures and leading meditation retreats around the world.

Phuket has also become a base from which Alan conducts his teachings. He has played a leading role in establishing the Mind Centre at Phuket International Academy (PIA), where he will be conducting the centre's first weekend retreat from April 10 to 11, open to the Phuket community. The 'Genuine Happiness' retreat is a workshop that will explore techniques used to cultivate a focused mind and an open heart.

Eastern spiritual concepts are accepted in the west, Alan said that more and more people were taking those first steps towards spiritual and mental development.

"I recently led a one-day retreat in Sydney, at which 3,000 people attended. There were people of all ages and all walks of life. For many, it was their first step into meditation, but the high number of people now attending these conferences shows that meditation has become mainstream."

Alan puts the increasing popularity of such retreats down to people's desire for more spiritual answers in a modern world, where he says many suffer from 'imagination deficit disorder'.

"There's good reason to believe that when you're in 'industrially-developed' countries, when you've got surplus wealth, you're comfortable and in good health, but you're still not content, not fulfilled or happy, you start looking around asking: 'What more?"

"Those with an imagination deficit disorder will say, 'more. More of the same'... 'I had good sex, so I need more sex... I only have one car, so I need another.' I met a guy recently who owned nine cars. He had to rent a warehouse just to keep the cars which he hardly ever drives.

"The imagination deficit disorder comes in and says, 'Well, I'm pretty happy having this much but I want to be happier, so I'll just have more of the same.' However, there are all sorts of scientific studies that show that this way of thinking doesn't work.

"Having nine more cars doesn't make you nine times happier."

"The single-minded pursuit of money, sex buildings, and even things like prestige, fame and Asked how his teachings on reputation, can all be part of that imagination deficit disorder."

"On the other hand, if you don't have enough to eat, don't have shelter, don't have enough clothing or medicine, this can make you unhappy. So this is the great question of the modern era. 'Once you've got enough, what now? Are we going to follow the example of the United States and Western Europe and just consume more?"

"It's a matter of choices and imagination."


At some point in the future, Alan anticipates a 'revolution' in scientific study of the mind, which is still a relatively new branch of modern science.

There have been two revolutions in modern science – the study of physics, which began about 400 years ago, and biology, which goes as far back as Darwin – but scientific study of the mind is only about 135 years old. "There has not yet been a revolution," Alan explained.

"Some scientists study the minds of others externally with questionnaires and by watching the brain and behavior of their subjects, but the problem there, is that no subjective experience is detectable from an objective perspective. In other words, psychologists don't have direct access to any one else's mind."

"Explaining scientifically the effects of meditation on the mind has always had the barrier of scientists 'studying' their subject (someone meditating). There is no scientific instrument or technology that can detect or measure thought, emotions, perception or states of consciousness."

The central theme of Alan's mission is complementarity. "I'm interested in expanding the horizons of both sides [spiritual and scientific]." Alan aims to achieve this by bringing Eastern and Western philosophies together

and continuing to work on research projects with cognitive scientists, psychologists and neuroscientists.

"Both sides have limitations. Buddhism has no brain science, no developmental psychology, no quantitative behavioral science. On the other hand, modern science has very little in terms of understanding compassion, how you develop attention, inner wellbeing, mindfulness and fulfillment.'

Although Alan lays no claim that neither [Eastern spiritualism or modern Western science] is better than the other, he did point out that Buddhism is six times older than modern science.

ccasionally, the European Union (EU) comes up with a set of rules that actually benefit the population.

This was true in respect to 'pension mobility' by residents of the EU member states – or set guidelines dictating how a citizen can transfer a pension if they

want to live in another country. Naturally, this was only allowed where the holder of private pensions actually moved to another country, prohibiting those from simply transferring their pensions on paper in order to gain tax benefits.

Britain, as a member of the EU, had no choice but to comply with the directive. This was despite UK politicians often protesting against the mobility of pensions. One example was a Liberal Democrat Treasury spokesman, Lord Oakeshott, who demanded that the UK Treasury "stamp out" this concession. "When you have pumped up your pension pot with top-rate tax relief, you can't then cheat the taxpayer by sailing off into a tax haven sunset to draw your pension," he said.

Lord Oakeshott had not taken into account that the British government would be sav-

ing money on National Health, Social Security and other benefits, all of which are considerable.

The average person leaving the UK on retirement is not a member of the ultra rich.

The mobility of private pensions became known as QROPS – Qualifying Recognized Offshore Pension Schemes.

When a UK pension is moved out of the UK, there must be an acceptable structure in the new country to accept this pension. This also requires that a trustee, acceptable to HMRC, is part of this transfer.

Some companies in Singapore abused the spirit of the pension legislation by allowing withdrawals and other irregularities. This resulted in HMRC refusing to recognize any pension transfer to Singapore.

It is not actually necessary for the pension to be domiciled in the country where the pensioner is living. For example, a pension holder could be a resident in Thailand and have the new pension trustees located in Guernsey of Hong Kong.

QROPS do not offer any route for changing a pension to cash as was tried in Singapore. QROPS do, however, allow income to be taken tax free and the normal 25 percent withdrawal is allowed.

With a QROPS, more free-

dom of choice for underlying investments is allowed and, importantly, at the age of 75, the individual is not compelled to buy an annuity. This can be very important, as it leaves a lump sum on death that can be passed on to beneficiaries.

Naturally, there is a substantial amount of red tape and form filling to be completed, however, this is the responsibility of a financial advisor and trustee.

At Global Portfolios we use trustees who update us on a weekly basis on the status of the transfer while it is in progress. This enables the client to know exactly what is happening.

QROPS are not some magical tool but simply a way of moving a pension from a high tax country to a tax free one. I have used both Hong Kong and Guernsey as bases, but the latter offers cheaper trustee fees.

When a pension moves offshore, there are strict controls over governance of the pension. The trustees are controlled by the relevant financial services authority in whichever jurisdiction is chosen. The examples of Guernsey, Channel Islands and Hong Kong are indicative of very advanced regulatory systems which are acceptable to the UK's HMRC.

Initially, it may seem complex, but the process of transfer-

ring pensions offshore from the UK is very routine. It is virtually mass production.

There is no alternative to the involvement of a trustee when using a QROPS. Even in the UK, there is always a trustee in place. Each trustee, in turn, has a list of acceptable 'platform providers'.

The main decision to be made by the pension holder is the style of investment, which are only composed to protect holders.

Everyone involved realizes that eventually, each pension holder has individual requirements, and these must be tailored to suit and flexible enough to change if and when necessary.

People who are contemplating using a QROPS scheme should be very aware that where anyone is offering 'extras' that they are stepping onto very dangerous ground. What happened in Singapore can happen to any jurisdiction that incurs the wrath of HMRC.

QROPS are worthwhile, but it all depends on the amount involved. One major QROPS trustee in Guernsey stated that the minimum amount that would normally be considered is 75,000 pounds. This is not a hard and fast amount.

If an individual had strong opinions on the matter and the amount involved was less than this, it could still be considered. However, these guidelines are established where the pension transfer would bestow benefits over costs.

During the first five years of the QROPS, new trustees are required to report back to HMRC. Should there have been unreasonable transfers to the pensioner, HMRC reserves the right to claw back tax relief. It is for this reason that people should only expect reasonable withdrawals.

The trustees can also intervene in the choice of investments, but the intervention should only occur to protect the client. Trustees will not otherwise intervene and I have always found them to be reasonable.

#### Hidato: How to play and this week's puzzle solution.









Robert Harris is two thirds of the way through a grip ping political thriller that takes place in Ancient Rome. *Imperium*, reviewed two weeks ago, takes the story of Marcus Tullius Cicero up to the moment of his triumph, assuming office as consul in 63 BC.

The second volume is *Lustrum* (Hutchinson, London, 2009, 454pp) and carries the story five years forward from the year of Cicero's consulship to his final battle as defender of the Roman Republic against a cable of power-hungry demagogues.

Central to this political drama is the conflict between Cicero and Julius Caesar, a senator just as crafty but much more ruthless. Cicero's great moment of glory was uncovering a plot in the Senate against the Republic



led by the ambitious, debauched, mentally unstable, charismatic Cataline. His great oration against Cataline in the Senate and his swift action to crush the plot led to his popular acclamation as Pater Patriae, father of his country. Caesar has been a member of the plot but managed to stay in the shadows and escape to Spain to gain military glory.

Cicero has three major legal and political confrontations with Caesar, outwitting him each time and nearly ruining him, but his time is drawing to an end.

Harris, in the voice of Tiro, Cicero's secretary and biographer, sets the stage brilliantly:

"Such was the state of the city on the eve of Cicero's consulship – a vortex of hunger, rumour and anxiety; of crippled veterans and bankrupt farmers begging at every corner; of roistering bands of drunken young men terrorising shopkeepers; of women from good families openly prostituting themselves outside the taverns; of sudden conflagrations, violent tempests, moonless nights and scavenging dogs; of



fanatics, soothsayers, beggars, fights. Pompey was still away commanding the legions in the East, and in his absence an uneasy, shifting mood swirled around the streets like river fog, giving everyone the jitters."

Cicero has formed an alliance with Pompey the Great, a great conquering general who, in many ways, was not too bright. They were together allied against Crassus, the richest man in Rome. Pompey comes vividly to life, a giant of a man, impetuous and vain, whom Cicero cleverly manipulates. Caesar is also sharply drawn, his flint-dry voice and mirthless laugh.

"I remember him most as a curious combination of hard and soft – the muscles of a soldier within the loosely belted tunic of an effete dandy; the sharp sweat of the exercise yard laid over by the sweet scene of crocus oil; pitiless ambition sheathed in honeyed charm."

Cicero's downfall is triggered by a farce. Clodius, a former protégé and youthful hellraiser, pulls a prank. During a sacred ceremony for the Good Goddess, attended only by women, Clodius sneaks in disguised as a women. He's discovered and flees in to the night. During a subsequent trial, he is acquitted through a massive bribery of the jurors. This sets the stage for his political rise as leader of a gang of street thugs who terrorize the patricians.

Cicero might have coun-


tered him, but Clodius is backed by a secret alliance: Caesar, Crassus and Pompey – the first triumvirate or "The Three Headed Beast" as Cicero dubs them. Their combined wealth and military strength will prove too much for him. Still, he resists to the end with dignity. Tiro sums up the best of his character in these words:

"But not the least of the reasons why I loved him, despite his faults, was that he possessed that most attractive form of courage: the bravery of a nervous man. After all, any rash fool can be a hero if he sets no value on his life, or hasn't the wit to appreciate danger. But to understand the risks, even to flinch at first, but then to summon the strength and face them down – that in my opinion is the most commendable form of valour, and that was what Cicero displayed."

In the end, Caesar completes his year of consulship and rides off on a five-year military campaign in Gaul. Cicero is ruined, fleeing Rome into exile with Tiro and a few other slaves. Volume three is still to come...

#### A deal must be struck

When it comes to showing visitors a good time, Phuket is hard to beat. As far as keeping them safe goes, the verdict has to be: must try harder.

Much has been written recently about the ongoing carnage on the island's roads. During high season we've heard less about Phuket's second most prolific killer, the sea.

News that the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO) has again failed to attract bidders to station life guards on our beaches is a troubling development (see page 1).

An island competing with the world's premier holiday destinations should make beach safety a top priority. To have no lifeguards on any beaches at all – the state of affairs since November – is unforgivable.

Last monsoon season a spate of tourist drownings shocked the island. At least 10 died on Karon Beach alone.

Most of those deaths happened while lifeguards, employed by previous tender holder LP Laikham, were stationed on the beaches, including Karon.

LP Laikham's contract was not renewed, amid accusations it failed to pay wages and provide its guards with the requisite equipment. Now no companies appear willing to take on the contract, despite the PPAO sweetening the deal.

If the PPAO must now find more money to attract a bidder, so be it. The consequences of having no lifeguards during this year's monsoon do not bear thinking about.

Much-maligned jet-ski operators, along with tuk-tuk drivers and tailor shop touts, often get the blame for soiling Phuket's image. Ironically, in the absence of any beach guards, the 'jet-ski boys' are now Phuket's primary lifesavers.

Everything must be done to ensure that well-equipped professionals are playing that role instead, and as soon as possible.

But the issue does not begin and end with lifeguards.

Many of the tourists who drowned in Phuket last year entered the water in spite of red warning flags and the protestations of lifeguards.

A well-funded danger awareness campaign would save lives. If that message can reach tourists before they arrive in Phuket – announcements on incoming flights are worth exploring – so much

Meanwhile, drowning remains one of the biggest killers of Phuket's local children. Their lives are taken not just by the sea, but by canals and the tin mine ponds scattered around the island.

Teaching them to swim – a task neglected by the education system – should be made a priority.

There will always be tragedies. But we can do better.

### Drink driving and the damage done



### **F**IRST **PERSON**

Nalinee Bunthawadchai has been the president of the Don't Drive Drunk Foundation's Victim Network in Phuket since its inception in 2005. Born on the island and currently employed as a clerk at Vachira Phuket Hospital, Ms Nalinee has been confined to a wheelchair for 20 years. Two separate road accidents

have left her partially paralyzed and missing a limb. Here she recounts the experiences that left her disabled, her work with the foundation and her views on drunk drinking and road safety issues in general.

have lived through two nightmares that changed my life forever. The first happened 25 years ago when I was on a bus bound for Bangkok, where I hoped to fulfill my dream of studying dance. The bus driver lost control and I lost my arm in the resulting crash, along with my dream of ever becoming a dancer.

Five years later I was celebrating my graduation with friends. The driver of the truck we were in was drunk. The resulting crash left me paralyzed in the lower half of my body. I came back to Phuket and spent almost a year trying to regain the ability to walk before finally accepting my fate and realizing I would have to move on with my life.

The Don't Drive Drunk Foundation's Victim Network started in Bangkok in 2001. I became president of the Phuket chapter in 2005. My job is to take care of our members, who are victims of accidents caused by drunk drivers. I also serve as MC at events at schools, hotels and local companies, giving speeches about our group's work and raising awareness about the dangers of drunk driving.

On the topic of road safety in Phuket, I am no longer surprised to see very reckless behavior, especially by motorcyclists. This includes ignoring the rules of the road, pulling out without looking, running red lights and not wearing safety helmets.

We currently have about 50 or 60 members in our network, far fewer than there should be given the number of accidents that occur here. One reason for this is that many victims come from rich, ethnic Chinese families who don't want to open themselves up to the public. Some of our members are still able to move around and go outside, while others are bedridden or even totally paralyzed.

We all work together in campaigning to raise public awareness of the dangers of drunk driving. To accomplish this we take part in parades and set up booths at high-profile events such as the Vegetarian Festival, New Year's celebrations, Old Town Festival, OTOP Fairs and other events that take place at Saphan Hin, for example.

Phuket is a tourist destination. As such there are not only many tourists, but also many people who come here to work from other provinces. The end result is a lot of people on the roads who don't know the local road network, including many who drive recklessly and with disregard for traffic laws. I sometimes see tourists with bottles or cans of beer in their hands and I feel concerned that they will try to drive afterwards.

I am quite happy with the work of the Traffic Police in Phuket. I think checkpoints help, especially with Thai people who are afraid of men in uniform and follow the rules when they see

police or approach a checkpoint.

But I also want the police to be strict with people caught driving drunk. When they are arrested they usually just pay a fine and get a suspended sentence of six months, a year or maybe two years - but they never serve any jail time. I would like to see the police put them in jail for a period, even if it is just a few days or weeks – to let them know what is in store if they drink and drive again.

I think the current alcohol limit for driving under the influence (0.05% by blood alcohol content) is appropriate because studies have shown that even a single can of beer can affect driving ability. That said, it is important that the equipment used to determine blood alcohol levels is working well.

I want to see drivers take responsibility by not driving when they plan to drink or using a taxi or tuk-tuk if they have had too much. I understand that renting a motorbike to get around might seem a cheaper option than taking a taxi or tuk-tuk, but you should consider that no amount of money can bring you back from the dead or buy you new organs, no matter how rich you might be.

I want to see Phuket become a place where people don't drink and drive. I understand that a lot of Phuket Gazette readers frequently drink and drive, but I advise caution. Don't think that just because it hasn't happened to you or your loved ones that you are somehow immune. It can happen to anyone of any nationality at any time. And if your drunk driving causes another person to be killed or maimed, simply saying 'I am sorry' is never enough. Words alone cannot undo the damage

### How do I get my deposit | Do I need a new license? back from my landlord?

I would like to know what to do when a landlord refuses to repay a deposit. As a resident here I have had problems getting my initial deposit back on several occasions. Apart from consulting an expensive lawyer, what steps should people take when a landlord refuses to pay back (or doesn't have) a deposit?

#### A lawyer at Phuket Provincial Court replies:

Bring the contract and the name and address of the lessor to the mediation center at Phuket Provincial Court. We will send a letter to the lessor asking them to come and explain why they have not paid the deposit back. If the lessor does not attend then you can sue

o you turn off your mobile phone when requested to do so by the airline before takeoff? For the majority of travelers, the answer is mostly, but not always.

This doesn't mean you are intentionally flouting the law and putting all other passengers and crew in imminent danger of crashing. It just means that passengers these days like to interpret, or misinterpret, the in-flight announcement to suit themselves.

The question these days, however, is whether the plane is truly at risk because a cell phone is on during a flight. The answer to this is yes, but increasingly less so.

Research carried out by the UK Civil Aviation Authority in the early 2000s showed that a number of electronic instruments in a plane are subject to malfunction by the interference that cell phone signals can cause.

Amongst a number of things, in-flight anomalies appeared when a cell phone operating at maximum level and located 30cm from vulnerable equipment or its wiring harness resulted in a freezing of the aircraft compass, unstable indicators, digital navigation bearing display errors, or reversal of the VOR navigation (VOR is an electronic aid used for landing, en-route guidance, weather forecasts, special flight instructions and other tasks).

That's a distressing list, but take heart - things are steadily improving. The risk of cell phone interference endangering an aircraft, particularly a large, modern jet, is very low. Aircraft are designed to cope with all sorts of emergencies and equipment failures.

But "low" is not good enough in the airline industry,

hence the continued ban on takeoff, climb, approach and landing.

However, today's cell phones are becoming an increasingly common sight on aircraft because of advances in in-flight technology. The first technology was employed on a Boeing 777-200LR demonstrator aircraft in 2005 and subsequently tested with Qantas Airways in 2007.

The technology was developed by UK-based company AeroMobile, which has been leading the race for safe use of mobile phones during flights. In March 2008, the AeroMobile system was used to make the first authorized in-flight calls on a commercial flight.

Here's how an in-flight mobile phone service, developed for the Irish-based low-cost carrier Ryanair by OnAir – another pioneer company – works:

Once your cell phone or smartphone is switched on it connects to a mini mobile network within the plane. The signal is transmitted to the ground through a satellite link where the data is transferred to OnAir's telecom infrastructure, then hooks into the public telecom network, which beams the data across the dialed phone number or requested website. At the moment, this is a limited service, but it is in the process of expanding.

In short, the technology has arrived. All that is required now is further development of it, and a change in social/public attitudes toward in-flight cell phone usage. As far as the airlines are concerned, they want mobile technology to be available, not only because it helps keep their customers happy, but because there is money to be made from the service.

In-flight cell phones, however, don't seem to have caught on in Asia as much as in the United States and particularly Europe. The exception is Malaysian Airlines, which since November 2008 has used AeroMobile systems to enable inflight voice calls and text messages. At last count it had a passenger adoption rate of 40 percent.

Low-cost carrier Australia V is also expected to take up Aero-Mobile technology. Both airlines fly directly to Phuket, so it may not be long before we see the service offered here.

AeroMobile and OnAir are licensed by specific airlines in Europe to use their technology and Emirates also began allowing voice calls on some commercial

flights in 2008. The most frequent objection raised to cell phone usage on

planes is to people talking while everyone else wants to quietly sleep, read, eat, drink or watch a movie. There is truth in this assertion. It's well established that most people talk louder on cell phones. The higher background noise on an aircraft would force people to talk even louder. Some airlines are looking at the concept of "cell phone zones" and "quiet time" on long-haul flights.


It was once argued that airlines were against cell phones in flights because they wanted to encourage passengers to use their own in-flight phone services, but these services are rarely used because of their expense. Airlines are finally catching up with the cell phone wave.

With the almost simultaneous growth in air transport and cell phone technology over the last two decades, they cannot afford to miss the plane.

### Dam delay

onstruction of a 5.7-million-cubic-meter reservoir and dam in Chalong is on hold for a few months while the Irrigation Department awaits approval to use Forest Department land needed for the project.

Funding for the 960-millionbaht Klong Krata Reservoir and a dam measuring 730 meters long and 25 meters high was provided under the Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives.

Of the project budget, about 300 million baht has been earmarked for acquisition of about 430 rai along the base of the Nakkerd Hills.

About 600 million baht will go towards construction of the dam across the existing Klong Krata (Krata Stream), and creating a 430-rai reservoir and recreational area.

The Klong Krata catchment area comprises a hilly area on the Chalong side of the Nakkerd Hills, the same area where a planned road connecting Chalong and Nanai Road in Patong is on

indefinite hold pending revision of its Environmental Impact Assessment.

The reservoir would cover much of the area between the Nakkerd foothills and Wat Luang Pu Supha.

Phuket Provincial Irrigation Office (PPIO) director Weerawat Aungsupanith told the *Gazette* the water will be used to augment domestic supplies in the area as well as to irrigate 200 rai of nearby farmland. The reservoir office will be located nearby at Ban Nakok.

The project would be funded under the central government's 100-billion-baht Thai Khem Kheng (Strong Thailand) stimulus package for 2012.

The only thing holding up the project now is gaining the right to use Forest Department land.

"Now we are just waiting for the for the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment to approve the request. I think it will take about one or two months. After that we can sign a contract with the project contractor," Mr Weerawat said.

To further increase supplies, work is also underway on a 41-million-baht contract to expand the storage capacity of two tin mine ponds, located behind Phuket Rajabhat University.

The two mines are separated by the back access road to the university.


The smaller of the two will be expanded to 15 rai and its storage capacity increased to 50,000 cubic meters under a 14million-baht budget.

The other pond will contain about 500,000 cubic meters of water and cover 90 rai when the 27-million-baht contract is

completed.

"The water situation is not so bad. The Bang Wad Reservoir still has enough water to last for three more months.

"The rainy season normally arrives around the end of April, so there shouldn't be any problems," Mr Weerawat said.

# Leisure man's dam gets a fresh look

Bang Wad Dam, a popular spot in Kathu for local residents seeking a bit of leisure, is getting an overhaul to help keep it clean and welcoming. A massive project is underway to add a new drainage system, a new bike path, new landscaping and build what is being called "the most beautiful toilet in Phuket."

Overseeing the makeover is Director of Phuket Irrigation Project Mr Weerawat Aungsupanith. Mr Weerawat said the improvements are being made as a result of the dam's growing popularity in recent years, especially with local expats. The improvements will help turn Bang Wad Dam into a full-on recreational park.

Construction is currently taking place on the new 9.7-million-baht drainage system, which stretches 3,250 meters around the dam. The purpose of the project is to direct water during the rainy season, which typically overflows from the hills surrounding the dam onto roads. This creates hazardous conditions from both the immediate flooding as well as the long-term damage to the road conditions. The new drainage will ensure virtually all the runoff from rainfall will avoid the roads and instead make its way into the dam.

Construction of the project started in January of this year by the company Chalearmyod Pattana from Nakorn Sri Thammarat. The company is hoping to complete constriction within 120 days, or before the end of May.

In addition to the drainage system, Chalearmyod Pattana is also building the infrastructure for a state-of-

the art restroom facility. Once complete, a separate company will design, decorate, and maintain the facility. Mr Weerawat hopes that it will become one of the most beautiful and hygienic restrooms in Phuket.

After the current phase of construction is complete, additional companies will be contracted to continue the other parts of the makeover, including a new bike path and new landscaping, which will include introducing new floral species to the area, as well as *salas* for people to

sit and eat. Plans are also in the works to include a security gate and sufficient lighting for the dam at night.

Mr Weerawat also told the *Gazette* that there are plans to expand the capacity of the dam reservoir by 3.3 million cubic meters by adding an additional three meters in depth. The construction schematics have been prepared, but Phuket Irrigation Project is still awaiting further approval that the dam, now 30 years old, is still strong enough to support the addition.



### Avocados in Rawai

#### Nosing around in Nikita's garden



recently gave a talk for the Phuket International Women's Club, which was hosted at a member's splendid home. It confirmed my already well-founded suspicions that the island is a tropical treasure trove

of exquisite gardens which are

well worth sharing with readers of this newspaper.

As it happens, the first garden we went to look at had been lovingly developed and tended by a lady, but not by a member of the aforementioned club.

Nikita, the person in question, owns one of the best known and longest established bars in Phuket.

Indeed, years ago the *Gazette* ran a piece about 'Nikita's', and not just about its extensive wine list, but also about the wide range of plants that grace the seating area.

Under the benign shade of a massive tamarind tree are lots of foliage plants – *crotons*, *dracaenas*, *aglaonemas* and *philodendrons*, and, to add some color, orchids in abundance.

All these plants are flourishing within arms length of the sea and its salt-laden winds. Clearly they get lots of TLC-so it was inevitable that Nikita and her English partner's house would also reflect this love of tropical shrubs and trees.

Their house is tucked away

on a hillside, and sits on a walled corner plot approached by a steep private road.

Nikita has made the most of this natural feature by creating a series of terraced gardens.

These are not formally patterned gardens; instead the aim has been to incorporate existing features such as the large boulders which flank one side of the green area next to the house.

This terrace, with its lawn of lush Malaysia grass, has quite an intimate and enclosed feel, with steep steps cut into the rock providing access to the next level.

It is there, the swimming pool, bordered on one side by swathes of *heliconias*, sends cascades of water over the sandstone-clad retaining wall, giving the impression that you are in a water garden.

The focal point of the property, there are plenty of mature trees here – after all the garden has been ten years in the making – included a specimen traveller's palm fully six metres tall, lofty coconuts, sealing wax and royal palms, and a whole range of avocado trees.

Avocados are much loved by Nikkie and her partner; they aim to grow a total of thirty in the next few years, and they are already two-thirds of the way there. Today the mature ones – which fruit after seven of eight years – were beginning to produce avocados, and all the signs presaged a bumper crop.

In the neatly tended borders were a range of shrubs and ferns, yellow-green pisonia alba, monstera deliciosa, better known in western sitting rooms as the swiss cheese plant, some fine coral plants jatropa multifida in full red livery.

They provided a splash of scarlet in a predominantly green garden, one dominated by foliage

rather than blooms.


On one of the mature trees was a magnificent staghorn fern, enjoying the dappled shade afforded by its situation.

It is evident that Nikita enjoys unusual plants.

A couple of strange leafless specimens with bulbous stems that almost filled their containers had been brought home all the way from Laos.

In Balinesque style, these are a number of thatch-roofed, low-rise buildings dotted around the grounds. One, above the swimming pool, serves as an office; another, at the summit of the property, has panoramic vistas across Rawai and beyond.

The sloping terrace below this viewpoint has more avocados and palms flanking the lawn.



Originally planted with Malaysia grass, the space was then annexed by a native grass which in turn has given way to a fine-leaved variety. It clearly enjoys the dry conditions there.

ting her own way.

So too the row of avocado trees, which respond positively to the well drained conditions in this elevated setting.

The garden's diversity is one of its fascinating aspects.

Divided into separate terraces, the different areas enjoy varied conditions, a series of micro-climates in one garden.

Thus the bottom terrace, situated below the main house,

supports a wide expanse of conventional lawn, dotted with mature palms and flanked by shrubs such as *mussaenda*. Shielding it from the approach road, a dense thicket of bamboo stands guard, ensuring the privacy of this very secluded space.

And at the end of the day, both literally and metaphorically, that is what this garden engenders; a palpable sense of tranquillity, a million miles from the hustle and bustle of the beach.
