

Ladyboy fraudster purchases hard time

TRANSSEXUAL supermarket cashier is in jail after stealing the chief of Kathu District's credit card and using it to buy a notebook computer.

Sarayut Yunu, a 24-year-old employee at a well known Patong supermarket, failed to return Kathu District Chief Siriphat Phathakul's card after a transaction on March 12.

After Mr Siriphat left the store, Pattani ladyboy Mr Sarayut passed the KTC Bank card to a friend, 18-year-old resort worker Sarina Doloh.

Miss Sarina used it to buy a 15,990-baht notebook at the store's electronics counter.

Unaware of what was happening, Mr Siriphat headed to Thalang to rehearse for his role as a Burmese prince in last week's Thalang Light and Sound battle reenactments.

KTC Bank called Mr Siriphat to check if he had made the purchase around 8:40pm.

"Then I remembered the cashier hadn't returned my card that day," he said.

Mr Siriphat immediately called the superintendent of Kathu Police, Col Arayapan Pukbuakao, who sent officers to

the store to investigate.

At the store they found the notebook transaction receipt with Mr Siriphat's card number on it. The slip had been signed with the name "Mali".

Officers questioned Mr Sarayut, who denied any involvement, telling the police Miss Sarina was responsible.

The officers took Mr Sarayut to the resort where his younger friend worked.

As soon as the group arrived, the resort security guard presented Mr Sarayut with the notebook computer, saying Miss Sarina had left it for him.

At this point, Mr Sarayut confessed all.

Mr Sarayut and Miss Sarina have been charged with conspiring to use another person's bank card without permission.

Mr Siriphat said, "I want cashiers to be more careful with credit cards. The cashier [at the electronics counter] didn't check the signature."

Col Arayapan worried about the effect the scam could have had on tourism. "If this happened to a tourist and they went home, what could we do?" he said.

"The road will be developed as a new business route in the near future and will also become part of the solution to Patong's traffic problems," he said.

Additional plans are in motion to move taxi, motorcycle taxi, rental car and tuk-tuk parking to the side of Phang Muang Sai Gor Rd, Mayor Pian added.

"This will allow for more public parking space on the beach road for tourists and local residents," he said.

Mayor Pian said a meeting with Phuket Land Transport Office to be held 'soon' would be the next step in moving Patong's transport plans

Tourism industry rides out red shirts

HE tourism industry in Phuket has not been affected by the red-shirt protests in Bangkok, according to the vice president of the Phuket Tourist Association.

Mr Krisada Tansakul said on March 16 the island-wide hotel occupancy rate was at about 65%.

"That's good compared to the March rate last year," he said. "Patong is faring especially well with a rate of 70%.

Mr Krisada said tourists still feel safe traveling to Phuket as it is far from the demonstrations and can be reached directly by international flights.

Reservation rates for April and the upcoming Songkran holidays were at an acceptable 30%, he said.

"However, if the political situation escalates, it is likely to have a negative effect on Phuket's tourism industry," he added.

Horrific attack

27-YEAR-OLD expat is still suffering migraines after he by night bandits at the end of last month in Rawai.

US citizen Glenn Gabourel Jr said robbers pulled a chain over Sai Yuan Road, knocking him off his motorcycle before beating him unconscious and stealing his cash and credit card.

At around 3am on February 28 Mr Gabourel had left the Laguna nightclub and was card and made their escape. heading north on Sai Yuan Road.

"Suddenly my bike just was brutally attacked flipped," he said. "I remember seeing three or four guys, then they hit me in the head with something."

> "I have no idea what it was but it looks like it was a pipe.

"There's a perfect circle on my scalp where my head was busted," he said.

Mr Gabourel said the bandits stole 7,000 baht, the credit

Two hours later a friend found Mr Gabourel back at home.

"I was lying on my sofa covered in blood with no idea what just happened to me," he said. "I have no idea how I got home."

The attack represents a disturbing development in an area already known for motorcycle robberies.

The attack has left Mr Gabourel with bruises and migraines.

"We believe these numbers to represent around 80% of the total cat and dog population in Phuket," Dr Weerapab said, noting that some owners do not vaccinate their pets and that an exact count of stray animals is impossible.

Cautioning that the number of stray animals will continue to grow in the future, Dr Weerapab intends to implement a sterilization program.

"One female dog will breed two times a year, giving birth to six to eight puppies each time," he said, pointing out the need to act quickly. "I don't want to have to deal with this problem when there are 100,000 stray dogs and cats on the island."

"The cost of sterilization is not cheap, about 1,000 baht. Some people do not sterilize their pets for this reason, so I am starting a project to sterilize 1,200 stray female dogs next year after receiving funding from Phuket Provincial Office.'

Problems rise over migrants

HE number of illegal aliens lured to Phuket for cheap . labor is on the rise, creating a greater strain on Phuket's social welfare department, according to

Jiranan Jiamjaroen, head of the Phuket Shelter for Children and Families (PSCF) said that alien workers, especially those in the fishing industry, are often deceived by employers with false offers of money and shelter.

Once in Phuket, many illegal aliens try to gain social welfare, according to Mrs Jiranan.

"We deal with numerous reports from Vachira Phuket Hospital regarding patients who are not covered by social welfare.

"Some of these patients flee Phuket hospitals without paying for treatment.

"Some run because they are scared of being arrested and sent to Phuket Immigration Office," she said.

"Essentially, they are running away from the hospital but don't know where they are running to," she added.

While employers turn their backs on their workers, many hospitalized illegal aliens "don't know where they live, or even their employer's name," Mrs Jiranan said.

"If we are made aware of any particular case, we will offer assistance immediately. They are humans, just as we are."

Waging war on rabies

ORE than 100 injection centers have been set up across the island in a drive to vaccinate Phuket's dogs and cats against rabies.

The livestock office campaign began on February 16 and will wrap up April 28.

Centers are operating daily except for weekends and public holidays.

"Instances of infection in dogs seem to be on the decline," said Dr Weerapab Tuemkiatpaisarn, a veterinarian with Phuket Provincial Livestock Office.

"We take random samples from dogs exhibiting suspicious symptoms such as nervous behavior and excessive salivation.

In 1993, we found that one in every five dogs sampled was infected with the rabies virus," he said.

Dr Weerapab said there have been cases of human infection on the island, with the number of occurrences peaking in 1992. Since then, the prevalence of the disease has declined.


As of 2000 there have been no detections of the virus in humans or dogs, he said.


However, there are still large numbers of stray animals in Phuket which pose a risk.

In 2009 Phuket Provincial Livestock Office counted 12,958 dogs, of which 2,567 were stray.

There were 4,203 cats counted, with 1,270 strays.

The statistics were compiled from the number of animals brought in for vaccination and those being fed at temples, schools, beaches and villages by various organizations such as the Soi Dog Foundation.



Naming the dead

HE SLOW pace of the tsunami victim identification process in Phuket has motivated researchers in Perth to build a database of skeletons to help identify bodies more quickly and accurately.

According to the Australian Broadcasting Corporation, the University of Western Australia has been given a \$400,000 grant for the project, which involves mapping the shape and size of bones.

Assistant Professor Daniel Franklin told WA's Stateline program that police will use the database to identify specific features of skeletons such as age, sex and ethnicity.

WA Police Superintendent Haydn Green was in charge of identifying victims in Phuket from the 2004 Tsunami.

He said the database will be extremely helpful in the future.

Intoxicating results

MAJORITY of *Phuket* while under the influence. Gazette readers have operated a motor vehicle in Phuket while under the influence of alcohol, according to the latest readers' poll.

A total of 844 readers cast votes in the survey.

Overall, 36.7% of readers have driven under the influence "many times", while just over 32% have done so "a few times".

Roughly the same proportion of Thai nationals (37%), expats (39%) and tourists (32%) said they had operated a motor vehicle "many times"

Respectively, 35%, 34% and 29% of readers have driven after drinking "a few times".

Tourists break from the pack with 38% claiming to have never operated a motor vehicle after drinking. Only 28% of Thai nationals and 27% of expat residents said they had never done so.

Although the numbers show that tourists are more likely to refrain from drinking and driving, it still stands that well over half of each demographic have risked Phuket's roads while under the influence.

IREFIGHTERS used almost 9,000 liters of water to put out flames that raged in the Chinese cemetery on Rang Hill in Phuket Town on March 11.

Ten firefighters in three trucks rushed to the scene after the fire started at about 1pm.

It took them around half an hour to bring the inferno under

Arthit Phromsiri, head of the Phuket Fire and Rescue

Department team that attended the scene, said the fires were probably started by men hired to clear the cemetery of vegetation in advance of the Chinese Qingming Festival.

Instead of clearing grass by hand, they just set it on fire, he said.

During the Qingming Festival, which takes place annually around April 5, Chinese are expected to pay respects to their ancestors at grave sites.


Cemeteries are cleared to

provide worshippers with access to the graves. A local resident said there are fires at the same site this time every year.


Firefighters were twice called to the cemetery a week prior to the March 11 blaze, when fires extinguished in the afternoon reignited at night.

Man returns as cock

AYUDHAYA: Villagers have been marvelling at a fighting cock they believe is the reincarnation of a young man killed last year.

The cock, born just after the man's death, has become attached to the man's girlfriend, following her around everywhere.

When Khao Sod reporters went to investigate the story on March 8, they found the bird sitting in a hammock with 17-year-old Phatsanan Khanthasaree at the noodle shop where she works.

The owner of the shop, Miss Phatsanan's aunt Wanna Khanthasaree, 55, said the fighting cock belongs to her nephew but behaves very oddly.

It has followed Miss Phatsanan everywhere she goes for the past five months.

Mrs Wanna said she believes the cock is the reincarnation of a young man named Yai who used to go out with Miss Phatsanan.

When addressed as 'Yai', the cock answers immediately by crowing, Mrs Wanna said.

Miss Phatsanan said she first met Mr Yai in the noodle shop where she helps her aunt. They went out for many years and would always sit chatting in

the hammock behind the shop. On June 7 last year Mr Yai was killed after being knocked off

his motorbike on the way home from the shop.

"I was very upset. Whenever I came to the shop I couldn't stop thinking about him, so I stopped coming," Miss Phatsanan said.

About five months ago Miss Phatsanan came to terms with the death and returned to the shop to help her aunt.

"The first time I came to the shop, the cock saw me and looked very pleased. He jumped over to me straight away and crowed," she said.

Since then, the cock has followed Miss Phatsanan everywhere, she said.

"Whether I'm sitting, lying down or whatever I'm doing he's always around. Even if people try to chase him off or lure him away with food, he will never leave me. I believe it is Yai's spirit that has been reborn as this fighting cock," Miss Phatsanan said.

Phitsanu Thusawut, 35, a close friend of the human Mr Yai and owner of the cock, said Mr Yai was very interested in fighting cocks and used to help him look after his flock.

Shortly after Mr Yai's death, Yai the cock was born.

When it was only three months old, it started to show odd behaviour for a fighting cock, Mr Phitsanu said.


It refused to fight and would not scratch around for food like other cocks, he said. Instead, it only wanted to hang around with Mr

This continued until the cock first saw Miss Phatsanan in the noodle shop. Mr Phitsanu said he believed Mr Yai had come back to be close to Miss Phatsanan as he still loves her.

Sadly, following the release of the story in the Thai press, Miss Phatsanan's father forbade his daughter from consorting with the cock as he thought "it looked odd".

However, after Miss Phatsanan reasoned with him, she was given permission to see the cock again.

Suspect chows on cop's ear

TRAT: A man wanted for a string of crimes, including rape, bit off part of a police officer's ear and stole his gun in an escape attempt on March 12.

At 1:30pm police were called to a hotel room in Muang District by a woman who claimed to have been tricked by 34-yearold Suthat Charoenruai into accompanying him from Chiang Mai with the promise of being given a car.

The woman said she met Mr Suthat in Chiang Mai three days previously.

She said he promised to give her the Toyota saloon he was driving if she went with him to Bangkok to transfer the ownership. Instead Mr Suthat drove the

woman to a hotel in Trat. Frightened, she contacted her family who called the police.

When officers moved in for the arrest, Mr Suthat locked his teeth on Cpl Seksan Aphimon's ear, ripping out a 2cm-wide chunk of flesh.

Mr Suthat grabbed the officer's side arm and fled to his car.

Mr Suthat soon abandoned the car and stole a motorbike.

A short time later police found the motorbike crashed by the side of the road.

Police searched a nearby forest and arrested Mr Suthat in a pig farm around 6pm.

Mr Suthat had 11 arrest warrants pending from Singburi, Lampang, Chanthaburi, Rayong and Trat. His list of suspected crimes include rape, false imprisonment, theft and embezzlement.

Korat cat gets a patent

NAKHON RATCHASIMA: A silver-blue, short-haired cat unique to this Northeastern province has been patented by the Livestock

The Korat cat, from Nakhon Ratchasima's Phimai District, is the first local breed to be patented in the department's drive to register Thailand's unique pet species.

MP Purapat Wisetjindawattana said the species had to be protected because there were only 2,000 Korat cats left in the country. They are so rare that they can fetch between 4,000 and 20,000 baht.

The Livestock Department will soon propose a draft calling for more unique pets to be patented, he said.

Chuchai Wisetjindawat, president of the Korat Cat Conservation Club, said that he was happy the Korat feline species had been patented successfully and that he hoped it would be designated as the national animal.

The breed is known to be intelligent, playful and loyal to owners. - The Nation

Ex-hubby admits to acid attack conspiracy

PHRAE: Police arrested the exhusband of a nurse for hiring someone to throw acid in her face on March 11.

The husband confessed he ordered the attack after his wife started seeing a Westerner she met on the internet.

Chanchira Phinphetch, 39, an assistant nurse at Phrae Hospital, was left with severe facial injuries following the attack.

Police immediately called Mrs Chanchira's former husband, 44-year-old Phatya Panchai, in for questioning. He denied involvement and was released for lack of evidence.

Later, Sarawut Uttha, 29, handed himself in to police for the crime.

He had also suffered injuries to the face and hands after being splashed by the acid.

Mr Sarawut said Mr Phatya paid him 500 baht to throw the acid at Mrs Chanchira.

He claimed he did not know the liquid was acid, saying Mr Phatya told him it was only very diluted cleaning fluid.

He said he agreed to do it because he was indebted to Mr Phatya who had previously helped him with financial problems.

After being brought in for questioning again, Mr Phatya confessed to hiring Mr Sarawut to throw acid on his ex-wife. He was angry she had started seeing a farang she met on the website Hi-5, he said.

The former husband and wife, who have two daughters together, split up after she began spending all her time chatting to her internet friend, he said.

The competition was organized by the hotel proprietor, Dr Anurak Tansiriroj, of Phuket International Hospital (Siriroj). Thai chess, also called *Makruk*, is board game descended from the 6th century Indian game of *chaturanga*, or a close relative thereof, and some players believe it involves more strategy than international chess.

"I have played Thai chess for 10 years and believe that it is one among many ways to prevent Alzheimer disease, because it exercises brain function. It also helps maintain Thai sport traditions and culture," said Dr Anurak.

In the past, chess players gathered at shops in town to drink coffee and play a game or two. However, with an official Phuket chess competition, Dr Anurak has taken the players from their local haunts and brought them together for a proper chess tournament.

The 37 male competitors were divided into two categories: open and new comers. The winners in both categories were awarded 20,000 baht and a trophy each. Winning the open category in the chess competition was Mr Somchai Eimprasert.

Sakchai Netchompu came first in the newcomers class.



Hélène Fallon Wood

Hélène Fallon Wood has been the official Honorary Consul for Ireland since December 2004, when she became actively involved in helping local people whose lives had been devastated by the tsunami.

"We lost four Irish citizens that day. The government of Ireland pledged 500,000 euros from Ireland Aid to help the local communities that were affected by the tragedy. I was able to identify certain needs and make proposals for the allocation of these funds."

Hélène advised the Irish government to fund small business projects, mostly in Khao Lak, for women who were the primary wage earners for their families. Grants allowed these women to start small operations, such as laundries, which enabled them to support their children.

Hélène also advised buying educational equipment for schools and worked with Princess Maha Chakri Siridhorn projects to replace destroyed houses.

She is also well known for her work with Life Home Project, a local charity providing housing and vocational training for HIV infected women and their children.

"In 2001, my son Brian came home from school with a notice about women needing food and clothing. I decided to check out their conditions and first be-

gan teaching them English three times a week. As the demand for supplies and facilities grew, I decided to launch a fund-raising campaign and held the first Life Aid Benefit Ball in 2003 at the JW Marriott Resort and Spa."

Hélène was able to raise three million baht and had equal success in 2004 and again in 2006 with similar Life Aid Benefit events.

"We then began to focus on building a permanent home for HIV infected families, and with the help of Ireland Aid, a very kind banker from Morocco and a family in California, who had lost parents in the tsunami, we were able to construct a purpose-built facility which houses 25 women and 30 children with six buildings, a day care center and a bakery."

And now Hélène is producing a St. Patrick's Ball, at the JW Marriott, for the Life Home Project on March 27, as again funding is in short supply and she is committed to maintaining the facility on Koh Sirey Island.

"The Life Home Project needs the support. We've been getting grants from the Thai government, UNICEF, Global Fund USA, and tremendous support from the Rotary Club of Patong, but our expenses exceed what is donated. As the Honorary Consul of Ireland, I decided to celebrate St. Patrick's Day with an

authentic Irish event featuring The Roaring Bhoys and a live Irish pub atmosphere."

Hélène is no stranger to producing successful events. When she lived in Ireland, she worked as a production manager making feature films and television series. One of her first jobs was in an ad for Canada Dry mixers, where she performed as a Mardi Gras dancer. Her dynamic personality impressed the director who recruited her as his assistant for the next couple of years.

She went on to work on a Roald Dahl production of 'The Witches' and a Maeve Binchey project, 'Echoes'. She also set up Britain's first home shopping TV network


Her last assignment in Ireland was as production manager on the popular feature film, 'The Commitments'.

When her husband, Peter Wood, suggested they move to Thailand in 1988, Hélène was up for the adventure.

She spent a long time enjoying her new life in the tropics at Fisherman's Way, but as she became aware of the needs of those less fortunate, she came out of semi-retirement to help.

"I want the Phuket community to know how the Life Home Project is doing, and to give them the chance for their continued support. We are again aiming for a fund-raising goal of three million baht, and those who attend can be sure of having a very good time."

he legendary 300SL was the original gull-wing Mercedes, achieving victory in many races in the Fifties.

An open version of the 300SLR famously won the Mille Miglia in 1955 with Britain's Stirling Moss and Denis Jenkinson.

The 300SL was introduced in 1954 as a two-seater sports car with the distinctive top-hinged doors.

It was launched at the New York motor show aimed at the booming post-war American car market. Apart from its unusual doors, it was also the first gasoline-powered car to be equipped with fuel injection directly into the cylinders.

Now there is a new gull-wing Mercedes: the SLS AMG, which promises to be equally successful.

Occupants of the SLS AMG are treated to a very special interior with a low seating position typical of sports cars, perfect ergonomics, and a high level of long-distance comfort. One important criterion for customer satisfaction is ease of access and egress through the exclusive gull-wing doors.

At the design stage, great attention was paid to the widest possible opening angle; it is a full 70 degrees. Equally important is the distance between the open doors and the road surface is a generous 1.49 meters.

Another important addition that makes for dignified access is two gas-pressure struts positioned next to the door hinges, which require only a little pressure to open and close the doors. In addition, the doors require less opening space than conventional coupé doors, and can be fully opened in a standard garage.

The power unit is AMG's proven 6.2 liter V8, the same found in the C63 and E63 sedans. Peak power is 571bhp (420 kW) at 6,800rpm, while the torque output is a massive 650Nm at 4,750. All this adds up to a benchmark sprint time of 0 to 100 km/h in 3.8 seconds and a maximum speed of 317km/h.

To rein in this performance, the SLS is equipped with composite disc brakes: internally ventilated and perforated at the front; internally ventilated and perforated disc brakes at the rear. A seven-speed, double-declutch sports transmission is fitted in a transaxle configuration.

The appearance of the SLS is as dramatic as its performance figures. To quote Mercedes-Benz:

"The distinctive styling of the SLS AMG demonstrates a passionate sportiness and reinterprets the breathtaking lines of the Mercedes-Benz 300 SL - one of the outstanding design icons of the Mercedes-Benz brand.

"With its purist design, the SLS reflects the philosophy of contemporary sports car engineering: the bonnet, which measures just under two meters; the low greenhouse, positioned well to the rear; and the short rear end with an extendable aerofoil are just as powerful a reminder of the superlative dynamism as the long wheelbase, the wide track and the large wheels.

"The short overhangs feed through into the proportions, as does the design of the super sports car with its low-slung front-mid-engine set well back and dual-clutch transmission in transaxle configuration."

Weight distribution front to rear is an admirable 47:53 and this, coupled with a low center of gravity, makes the SLS one of the best handling cars in the Mercedes-Benz line-up.

A host of options is available with the car when it goes on sale in spring this year, including an advanced ceramic composite high-performance braking system, a sophisticated Bang & Olufsen BeoSound AMG surround sound system, sports bucket seats, a performance steering wheel in leather and Alcantara, and a carbon fiber interior package that includes seat backs, sills and door panels.

Buyers are already queuing up to order their SLS AMG Gullwing, even with a price tag of around 177,000 euros.

It is a remarkable machine and is likely to become a classic, much as its predecessor of the 50s is now viewed.

Shrimps in sarongs

SILK restaurant has a new look and venue and has added a selection of Italian cuisine to its menu of traditional Thai dishes. Now located at Andara resort and villas in Kamala, the new SILK has spacious indoor and alfresco dining options with a view over the swimming pool and bay beyond.

This new venue with a view is a stylishly spacious highceiling alcove of wood and glass that allows large groups to dine together while still leaving enough distance between other diners with more intimate ambitions.

The restaurant's signature dish is Kung Sarong (shrimps in sarongs), which can be ordered separately (325 baht) or as part of a finger food platter of appetizers served with traditional Thai dipping sauces. The shrimps are artfully wrapped in fried Phuket noodles and dipped in mango sauce.

The Thai appetizers range from 215 to 415 baht and include several vegetarian dishes and other Thai classics like spring rolls and stuffed crab.

The list of wines from around the world, including champagne, is extensive, but non aficionados can easily pick wines by the glass (295-320 baht) from a short list that includes a sparkling wine, two reds, two whites and a rosé.

Italian appetizers include salads, soups, pasta, eggplant and seafood dishes infused with mouth-watering Mediterranean cheeses, oils and herbs.

Among the many seafood, meat and poultry main Thai dishes (425 - 995 baht) are some interesting fusion salads, like pomelo with tamarind dressing and crispy challots (225 baht). The 'Healthy Stuff' section has a variety of light and mainly vegetarian dishes, such as tofu in thick creamy curry (265 baht).

The small selection of desserts includes the Thai favorite, sticky rice and sweet mango (215), and coffee lovers can finish off with a nice strong cup of Vittoria coffee.

SILK's Thai dishes come in sizable portions, large enough for farang appetites, but they don't pack the same flavorsome punch to the palate as you'd find at less classy local joints. This does make the restaurant a good venue to introduce Thai cuisine to uninitiated newcomers but would leave your average expat or Thai hankering for a more fulfilling foray into the contrasting flavors of street-side Thai food.

Exploring Italy's culinary identity

ifth generation winemaker Claudio Lenotti of the Cantine Lenotti label brought a collection of his north Italian wines to the tables of Dusit Laguna's La Trattoria Italian restaurant last week.

The evening started in the restaurant's grounds with a classic light and 'peachy' summer wine; Cantine Lenotti's only rose, Chiaretto Bardolino Classico.

Once seated inside, La Trattoria's little Italy by the beach came to life. The décor and tableware, a simple and elegant blend of classic and modern styles, is subtle yet stylish. White linen covers the tables adorned with classic cutlery and custom-made glasses in this 130-seat restaurant by the sea.

Winemaker Claudio began to educate the audience about the wines of his country. Apart from soil and weather, Italian wines are distinct in that they are usually named according to where they were produced, rather than the more common use of the grape variety to name a wine.

The Cantine Lenotti winery is in the hilly area of Bardolino, near Verona in northern Italy, and produces at least 20 different wines.

For this 'extraordinary' wine dinner, La Trattoria's head chef, also an Italian named Claudio, conjured up a five-course meal paired with four Lenotti wines.

Although La Trattoria prides itself on 'authentic' Italian cuisine, Chef Claudio couldn't help adding some contemporary twists to his traditional dishes.

A light yet complex white, Colle dei Tigli 2008, accompanied the first course of gratinated Hokkaido scallops, made sweet with orange granite.

Claudio explained that the full-bodied and fruity aroma with

hints of peach and apple was the most suitable wine to begin the culinary journey.


Chef Claudio's next course was two thin slices of raw veal (veal carpaccio) with horseradish, truffle oil and shaves of Castelmango cheese, which was accompanied by Lenotti's Pinot griglo del Veneto 2008.

This pairing created an entirely different sensation, as both the wine and the dish were distinctly pungent yet mixed harmoniously.

Winemaker Claudio had deliberately chosen two very different wines to start the meal and was keen to demonstrate that diners' individual tastes and preferences were what mattered, not necessarily the name and year of the wines.

A show of hands proved that about half the diners preferred the light bouquet of Colle dei Tigli, while the rest voted for the Pinot griglo.

Of course no trip to Italy would be complete without a risotto. Chef Claudio broke the rules here by putting two pulses in the same dish, but the risk payed off and the filling risotto went down a treat with the

evening's first red, a fruity and complex Capomastro Rosso del Veneto 2007.

Winemaker Claudio was especially excited about the penultimate main course of braised beef cheek and porcini mushrooms, as it was the perfect opportunity to show off his winery's classic red, Amarone della Valpolicella Classico 2005, which has a full-bodied slightly bitter, velvety taste. It was the perfect accompaniment to the rich meat dish.

For dessert, Chef Claudio presented caramelized pears and cinnamon ice cream with almond tart, while the diners polished off the rest of the Amarone.

The two Claudios did an excellent job of taking diners on an adventurous culinary journey to the land of art and romance in the latest installment of Dusit Thani Laguna's 'best of' Wine Series. Everyone left feeling satiated but not overly full.

This Saturday, La Trattoria is holding a special candle-lit dinner from 7pm for this year's Earth Hour, which begins 8:30pm local time. Bookings can be made directly at the restaurant or by calling 076-362 999. Ext 7303.





The Euro rattles with its weakest links

The Greek prime minister has told the heads of state of France and Germany that his country does not require a bailout.

Pointing to Greece's recent success in raising funds on the bond market, the Greek PM then went on to state that Greece simply cannot afford to continue to raise money at these expensive interest rates.

The reality is that Greece did manage to raise funds in the bond market – albeit at 6.4% – which is substantially higher than the more 'credit worthy' member states of the Euro pay for funds.

However, Greece would not have been able to raise funds at all if the bond market believed

that there was any risk of a Greek default. On arriving in Germany, the Greek PM heard, via the media, Germany's Finance Minister state that not one cent of German taxpayers' money would be used to bailout Greece.

Now, the Greek PM has visited the US stating that he is not seeking a bailout, but could do with assistance.

European law relating to member nations of the Euro Zone state that no member state will bailout another.

In addition, all member states are expected to adhere to the 'stability pact', which states that no member state will run a budget deficit in excess of 3 percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) or allow total government debt to exceed 60 percent of GDP.

However, in the eleven year life of the Euro, all member states have been guilty of breaching these rules. Unfortunately, this has now led to some member states running double digit budget deficits and government debt in excess of 100 percent of GDP.

A common currency such as the Euro requires that member states adhere to its rules; when these rules are ignored, it can be the beginning of the end for that currency. History is littered with examples of unsuccessful attempts to create currency unions.

The correct route for Greece to take is to approach the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for assistance.

However, Greece is trying to avoid that route, as IMF terms are likely to be harsh and there is also some muddle-headed thinking that Euro Zone states should not embarrass other members by seeking IMF assistance. It should not be necessary for any member state to be in financial difficulties that cannot be rectified internally.

The reality is that Greece is merely the tip of the iceberg. If it was only Greece that faced severe difficulties, they would have already been fixed.

On March 9, the well known business channel Bloomberg Television reported that the Spanish economy, also a member state of the Euro Zone, is in severe difficulties. Fitch, one of the "Big 3" credit rating agencies, told a Bloomberg researcher that the Spanish economy is in trouble.

Bloomberg went on to point out that many well known economists were very negative about Spain's economic prospects.

Unemployment is now at 19.5 percent and youth unemployment for those under 25 now stands at a staggering 45 percent.

There are also 900,000 unsold housing units lying vacant in Spain and the property market is in a meltdown.

Spain is apparently trapped: its budget deficit is in double digits, government debt is vastly ahead of the 60 percent of GDP limit and with the economy in trouble, it is difficult to see an escape route.

To bring the budget deficit down and government debt to be contained will require a strong austerity program. However, the Spanish population will resist problem for Spain to refinance further austerity measures by mass strikes, demonstrations and

other unwanted measures.

Austerity will also not allow the Spanish economy to grow, which creates even more problems.

It appears likely that Spain can postpone its most serious problems until June this year, when the Spanish government has to repay substantial amounts of debt. It is going to be a real itself in the bond market.

Should the Euro Zone come

to the conclusion that it must ignore its own laws and rescue Greece, Spain and any other "worthy" claimant, then it is sowing the seeds of its own eventual destruction.

Historically, countries such as Spain and Greece that faced severe economic problems had an escape route: the currency

This time around they are tied into the Euro, which means the escape route is not available.

Bloomberg came to the conclusion that the only viable alternative for countries such as Greece and Spain is to return to their original currencies, the Drachma and the Peseta respectively, where the devaluation option is open.

The UK is fortunate that it never adopted the Euro or they would be facing the same problems as Greece, Spain and maybe others.





The case for vigilance

Two recent fraud cases highlight the continuing need for personal vigilance in keeping the money in Thai bank accounts safe.

Last week a supermarket cashier admitted buying a laptop computer using a credit card belonging to none other than the chief of Kathu District, Siriphat Phathakul (*see page 1*).

The rouse was simple. Neglecting to return Mr Siriphat's card after a transaction, Sarayut Yunu passed it to a friend, who used it to buy the 16,000-baht notebook at the same store's electronics counter.

A simple yet crucial safeguard – the signature check – was neglected.

This will come as no surprise to anyone who regularly uses a debit or credit card in Thailand, where even a cursory glance at the card signature is a rarity. Mr Sarayut's young accomplice, Sarina Doloh, knew there was no need even to forge the victim's signature, signing the receipt with a made up name.

Until the chip-and-pin system is adopted universally, better training of counter staff is a necessity.

Two editions ago the *Gazette* reported the case of Frenchman Claude Prigent, victim of an audacious fraud by another man also bearing the name Claude Prigent.

The 'offending' Claude Prigent walked into the victim's bank and asked for a new ATM card and bank book. He received both, and went on to spend at least 164,000 baht of his namesake's money in a spree in Phuket, Pattaya and the Philippines.

The bank has since refunded the victim's money. But the inconvenience the affair caused him was considerable.

The bank's employees made several mistakes along the way. When the 'bad' Claude Prigent walked into a branch on Koh Chang, the employee told him there was already an account in his name. Thurdsak Chusak, a vice president at the bank, suspects Prigent tricked the employee into giving out the location of the account branch and the amount of money in the account.

A simple check of the man's passport number would have told the clerk this man had no right to such information.

The fraudster was then able to walk into the victim's branch in Chalong and walk out with an ATM card for the account.

Again, an inspection of the man's passport would have prevented the trouble that followed.

Nevertheless, it's worth pointing out that it took the swindler around two months to spend Mr Prigent's savings.

Had the victim paid more attention to his dwindling bank balance, the alarm could have been raised on the errant Claude Prigent before he made it to Manila.

The lesson learned in both cases? A little personal vigilance goes a long way.

Improving service at Immigration



FIRST PERSON

New Superintendent of Phuket Immigration, Col Panuwat Ruamrak, has been on the job for three weeks. A native of Suphanburi province, Col Panuwat graduated from the Royal Police Cadet Academy in Nakhon Pathom. He went on to spend two years in Washington DC, USA, where he earned a Master's

Degree in Public Administration. At 40 years old, he is working for the first time in southern Thailand. He harbors no illusions about the gravity of his new position. Here he talks to the Gazette's Kitima Pornmongkhonwat about the work to be done.

never expected to find myself here in Phuket, but I wasn't surprised. My first thought was that this is going to be a challenging job with high expectations from my superiors that I succeed, so I have to do the best I can.

I don't want to get into any details about policies I wish to pursue yet. I will probably start with small things in the office. I intend to treat this office as my home and make sure it is clean and functioning properly from the main gate to inside the buildings.

It is especially important that the staff provide good customer service to those coming in to the office, most of whom are tourists.

I have to admit that we are understaffed, as we only have eight employees to handle all work related to visa extensions. However, all government offices are the same; it is not only us. So, there is no need to complain. We just need to organize and put our best into the job.

Sometimes tourists have to wait quite long, but the worst case is no longer than 45 minutes. Normally everything can be finished in about 15 minutes. However, if it is a Monday, or the first day after a long holiday, the office will be busier than usual, which is understandable.

If you are aware that there is an issue that requires you to contact Immigration, it is best to take care of the problem by

coming to the office early instead of waiting until the last minute.

I am pleased with our staff here because I can see that they are working hard. The job is busy and can be stressful, so sometimes they don't smile too much; it doesn't mean they are being rude.

I am looking into customer service training for our staff to help them handle the stresses of the job.

I don't have the attitude that foreigners are criminals and miscreants. Most tourists are here to enjoy their holidays, not to engage in illegal activity.

As for issues regarding illegal aliens, it is government policy for many organizations to work together; not only Immigration. We have been arresting illegal aliens and deporting them at checkpoints suitable to them and their situations. That will continue to happen here in Phuket.

I have confidence that within the range of our responsibilities we take care to treat all illegal aliens fairly. We provide them with accommodation and enough food before sending them back to their home

I have no comment about issues of mistreating illegal immigrants as they have entered or tried to enter our country illegally and have been arrested.

I want to see Phuket and the whole of Thailand clean and safe.

FC Phuket top of the league

FC Phuket 2, Satun Utd 0

C Phuket sent out a serious statement of intent with an emphatic 2-0 victory over league leaders Satun Utd last Saturday. The performance left the unbeaten Sea Kirin top of Division Two (southern section), leading the table with 11 points.

There is an old proverb that goes, 'taxes grow without rain'. Given both the current water supply shortage and impending tax increases, this adage looks to be a bit stranger than fiction.

Last year, Thailand's economic stimulus package for the property sector created a feeding frenzy of hurried transactions, though like the closure of famed nightspot Studio 54, 'the party now looks to end' on March 28.

While developers have been salivating at the chances of a renewal of the package, the Cabinet recently announced that there will be no 'saved by the bell' scenario for the initiative.

Specific business tax (SBT) will increase from 0.1 to 3.3 percent, transfer fees revert from 0.01 to 2 percent and mortgage fees will escalate from 0.01 to 1 percent.

Land department offices all over the country have been hurriedly trying to get in last minute transactions, while buyers looking to save have been purged from the sidelines and into the field of play.

The stimulus package has been effective, but many are

now asking: What's next?

Keeping control of management

velopments has gained popularity in recent years. Many buyers appreciate the accomodations provided by living in a managed estate, where the use of project roads, common areas, facilities and amenities are all included.

The expense of these services is shared among the other buyers and guests in the development. When searching out a property with this pre-existing management, it's important to remember that these services and accomodations need to be managed and maintained.

Obviously, proper management of a project is of importance in order to maintain both appearance and smooth running of a development.

Ultimately, all buyers should benefit from a well-kept property. At the very least, it will hold the value of the units, and at best, it can even boost appreciation values.

Therefore, when considering the purchase of a property in a managed estate, it is advisable to diligently review the relevant legal documentation regarding the management of the project.

In the event that a buyer intends to buy into a condominium project some safeguards will be provided by law. For example, the recently amended Condominium Act.

urchasing a property in managed de- condominiums provide protection for owners who posses smaller portions of the propety. This is so owners of more than one unit in a condominium do not obtain majority voting rights and thereby also gain majority control over management.

If, for example, a single owner has purchased 10 units in a 15-unit condominum, he would not also possess majority voting rights. The 'Condo Act' ensures control of management stays in the hands of all the owners of the property, not a single owner of the majority of the units.

Further protection is provided by the new Condominium Act by requiring developers to submit their marketing materials, which often includes a plan for management. This information is usually approved by the competent authorties prior to registration of a development as a condominium.

Buyers should also beware that when buying in an apartment or villa in a project, the Condominium Act's protections do not apply. If a property is not classified as a 'condominium', developers have the option of retaining certain areas of management.

Therefore, a buyer should carefully review all relevant documentation prior to signing, such as master plans, rules and regulations, in order to verify that the developer is clearly identifying the The laws pertaining to owning common use facilities of the project.

If a developer wishes to retain certain areas – such as club house – as private property, this should be diclosed under the agreements.

A developer may prevent buyers as well as third party management companies from accessing all project areas if they retain ownership of those projects.

However, sophisticated developers have implemented structures that provide their buyers with the required peace of mind when signing agreements.

Under such structures, buyers will not only acquire interest in their chosen unit, but also in the company which owns the project land. This often includes the common areas and facilities, which then gives owners partial responsibity for the management of the project.

The advantage is obvious. It allows the buyers in an estate to participate in and ultimately control the management of the project, including its common properties, either provided by the landowning entity itself or through a thirdparty management company contracted by the landowning company.

To summarize, proper and professional management of a development is of paramount importance to achieve successful and harmonious operation of a project in which all buyers ultimately benefit.

It is required not only to ensure smooth running of the project but also helps to hold value of the units when it comes to a resale.

Phuket's property perks and pitfalls

Imost every Phuket home owner will ask their real estate agent during the early stages of their investigations into rental opportunities, "What can I expect my rental returns to be?"

The answer: "What would you like them to be?"

Although this may seem flippant to some, it actually opens a dialogue between the owner and realtor about expectations and requirements for setting up their home for rental operations.

Development on the west coast has always been the preferred area for owners, renters and visitors alike. North, South or Patong all have their influences and tendencies which; favor a particular kind of tenant and rental opportunity for consideration when buying.

Most European homes are designed for colder climates. This means that the home is accessed through one entrance and under one roof.

Modern Asian designs embrace the open "sala" style. Although providing an open plan for outdoor living, with individual rooms opening onto a central courtyard with pool, they can have drawbacks. Design of exterior walkways can make the home impractical during rainy season and reduce the chances of satisfied long-term tenants.

Many families, either on long or holiday tenancies have reservations about having children sleeping in rooms with direct, unfenced access to pools. Not to mention personal security relating to intruders; something that cannot be ignored in Phuket's fast and furious development.

The choices between residential orientated developments versus lifestyle resort homes are now even more sophisticated.

Residential properties have

always meant more freedom for the owner and lower management costs due to the lower levels of service offered.

Since the introduction of resort property ownership by Laguna, there have been a stream of international and regional resort home ownership options which have come online.

These are having a major impact on the market. Outrigger, an international operator from Hawaii, caused ripples last year when it was appointed to the Laguna Village rental operations; thereby putting pressure on long standing homes to revisit their

rate structure. What the return on investment to owners will be remains to be seen. Considering the low rates on offer and a significant marketing machine to back it up, rental owners will need to sit up and pay closer attention to ownership trends if they wish to remain competitive.

Then there is the question of why did you buy?

If it was for investment and rental return, then your primary decision is made easier inasmuch as you need to find the operator providing the biggest guaranteed rental return and the lowest management fees. Leave it up to the rental agent and watch the money flow.

Just bear in mind that a guaranteed rental return is not necessarily an indication of the robust nature of Phuket's rental market, as much as a handy sales and marketing tool.

Any developer worth his trowel and plumb line will have hedged his bets knowing the ups and downs that have affected Phuket's rental industry.

If you are based in the region and intend to use your home as a getaway every couple of weeks, then the occupation limits in place at resorts are not for

You need an agent that can service holiday rentals, normally between four and 14 days. This allows flexibility to block the house off for your own use at relatively short notice. Of course, this eliminates long-term rentals covering many months of steady income

Similarly, if you intend to occupy your home over the high

season then you are willing to forfeit the 'golden fleece' that is high season rentals and be satisfied with a long-term tenancy or two during the low season.

Once you have identified the major criteria above, you will need to look at how best to furnish, set up and service your home. All rather time consuming, however, with the advice and assistance of a good rental agent, you could be spending a lot more time on the beach.
