Back from the brink

Phuket's finest return after duty in war-torn Bangkok

Phuket police are safely back on the island after a hellish experience on the streets of Bangkok, where they manned security checkpoints at the height of the red-shirt rebellion.

The officers were led by Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Peerayut Karajedee, a native of Nakhon Sri Thammarat who has spent 27 years in uniform, more than 20 in Phuket.

"The situation in Bangkok was scary and very difficult to control," said the 48-year-old father of two.

The police role was to control movement through checkpoints and serve as backup for army units clearing protesters from the streets. After soldiers drove red shirts out of restricted areas, it fell to the police units to ensure they didn't return and resume their activities, he explained.

The mission was ordered by the Center for the Resolution of Emergency Situation (CRES), which placed the officers under the command of the Second Cavalry Division King's Guard.

The Phuket contingent, comprised of officers represent-

ing every police district on the island, were ordered to the capital in two units.

The first group of 170 officers left Phuket for Bangkok on April 26 and stayed in the capital until May 14, when they were relieved by the second group of 166 officers under the direct command of Col Peerayut.

Col Peerayut's men had a lives while others crouched for rude welcome awaiting them. On their first day of action they were stationed near the Thai-Belgium Bridge when three or four grenades from an M79 launcher began exploding around them.

With no way of knowing where the bombs were launched from, some officers ran for their

cover.

The most serious injury was to an officer whose face hit the ground, causing a 'hemifacial spasm' that affected the muscles in the right side of his face and functioning of his right eye. He has since recovered.

Tourists to sober up in Patong 'drunk tank'

OURISTS who overindulge and get into trouble in Patong may soon be left overnight to sober up in a 'drunk tank', according to plans presented at the second ever meeting between honorary consuls and Phuket authorities on May 24.

Another major proposal mooted at the meeting, held at Phuket Provincial Hall on May 24, was to set up a call center to coordinate taxi services in Patong.

Phuket Vice Governor Smith Palawatvichai chaired the meeting, which was attended by representatives of 16 countries: Australia, Austria, Czech Republic, Denmark, England, Estonia, France, Germany, Italy, Ireland, Korea, Norway, Netherlands, Russia, Sweden and Spain.

Phuket Provincial Police reported the number of foreigners who died or were involved in criminal cases so far this year.

To May 12, 33 foreigners died of causes including accidents, health problems, drowning, drug overdoses and murder.

To April 26, 84 foreigners were charged with criminal of-

s at the meeting on May 24. very concerned by the statistics, as safety and security are key factors considered by tourists when choosing a holiday destination.

German Honorary Consul Dirk Naumann asked for 'more understanding' from police officers when drunken Germans swore at them.

"Thai police aren't used to this kind of abuse," he said. "From our side we can only request that Thai police understand that in most Western countries the police do not have the same status as Thai police."

V/Gov Smith said that many tourists came to Patong to get drunk, which meant security measures there should be different to other areas.

"In the future, a special area for drunk tourists will be set up to hold them for a while until they sober up. There'll be no need to go to the police station," he said. On the subject of Thailand's current political crisis, Mr Paiboon said the Phuket authorities would coordinate to ensure Phuket remained safe for tourists from around the world.

Mr Naumann said that German travel advice was not to travel to Bangkok, the North or the Northeast, but that travel to Phuket was safe.

British Honorary Consul Martin Carpenter raised the subject of the island's transport, asking how many tuk-tuks were registered in Phuket.

A Land Transport Office representative said that there were 1,130 registered tuk-tuks and that this number would not be allowed to rise.

Mr Carpenter also proposed introducing a service in which people who had gone out and had too much to drink could call a local driver who would come and drive them home in their own car.

Consuls also reiterated that sometimes police failed to inform them when foreign nationals from their countries were involved in criminal cases.

Every consul affirmed that police could call their offices because their secretaries were Thai and there would be no language problems.

It was also agreed that every honorary consul would receive a pocket book listing the telephone numbers of Phuket's government offices, police stations and important places.

The third honorary consuls meeting is scheduled to take place August 23.

Another of Col Peerayut's men suffered an attack of gallstones that required hospital treatment. Many others suffered lesser injuries that did not require medical attention.

The Phuket Police were divided into three six-hour shifts. On the fourth shift of the 24-hour watch were officers from Chainat Province, one of whom was killed by an M79 grenade.

"At first our duty was to establish a checkpoint on Rama IX Road to restrict access to the Rajprasong area. The checkpoint was later moved to Witthayu Junction. The situation changed dramatically when [red shirt military commander] Seh Daeng was shot on May 13, just after we arrived," said Col Peerayuth.

Despite the grenade attacks, the Phuket officers never fired directly on red-shirt protesters but did fire warning shots into the air, he said.

Due to a lack of accommodation, officers from the second detachment set up a makeshift urban bunker with tents and mosquito nets in the parking lot of a military base less than one kilometer from the protest site. Periodic gunfire was exchanged between officers in the camp and protesters as columns of black smoke rose into the sky from protest sites in the city.

Crowd control training conducted in Phuket in recent years helped the officers deal with their first real confrontation with armed protesters, he said.

Most of the time the officers were more frustrated than afraid because they didn't know when the situation would end, he said.

"We were all very happy to come back to Phuket," he said, adding that he thought it very unlikely that similar protests could happen here in the foreseeable future.

New crime fighters

PAIR of two-month-old puppies are the latest additions to Phuket's arsenal in the fight against drug trafficking. Currently being cared for at the house of Muang District Chief Supachai Pochanukul, Nin and Chao Kuay will start a drug detection course when they are six months old.

After completing five months of training at the Phuket International Dog School on Koh Sireh, the two Labrador and Spitz mix dogs (one male and one female) will join the Phuket Volunteer Security Force.

Chief Supachai said, "I got the puppies from a friend to make my team more efficient. Until now we have been using manpower, urine tests and Alpha 6 substance detectors to search for drugs.

"But, I think dogs will work better than any equipment or officers because of their sense of smell. I will have Nin and Chao Kuay working with me at checkpoints by this coming New Year's celebrations," he said.

CAUGHT: Brothers Niphon and Niphan Kruae-in.

The suspects did not attempt to flee and surrendered to police, Col Wanchai said.

Witnesses to the murder, which took place in Rassada on March 21, said both men attacked Mr Ponsan.

Only Mr Niphan has confessed to the crime, however.

The brothers told police they were stressed out at the time because they were unemployed.

Mr Ponsan, who lived next door, had been drinking and talking loudly with a co-worker.

He had also been cooking fish, the smell of which annoyed the two brothers, police quoted the pair as saying.

According to the suspects, the final straw was when they twice told him to quiet down, to which Mr Ponsan responded by approaching them and shouting, "How am I being noisy?"

The response to Mr Ponsan's query was the fatal stabbing to which Mr Niphan has now confessed.

Both men fled after the killing. They disposed of the knife near the Phuket Provincial Administration Hospital, police said.

They are being held while police continue the investigation. - Sitthipong Nongkaew

Phuket air traffic control dismisses 'chemtrail' video

IR traffic control officials have dismissed as "crazy" **L** a video circulating on the Internet purporting to show a mysterious unmarked airplane leaving "chemtrails" in the sky over Phuket.

The video was posted on YouTube on May 19 by a user calling himself "robinhoodlum".

"Chemtrails in Phuket. Caught on tape at last," says the narrator in a British accent, as the camera follows a plane leaving a trail through the sky.

The video invites users to speculate over "what the hell" the substance is. "I doubt it's something that makes us healthy and boosts our immune system," robinhoodlum posted under the video.

Other users have posted theories. "The barium gets into your head and shows up on global positioning systems designed to work off the barium in your head. Aluminum amplifies the signal by also accumulating in your head," wrote Kitt0000.

Samonitus connected some dots: "Wonder if it has something to do with the hostilities in Bangkok. The trails probably contain tranquilizer."

Nopadol Soonsit, Air Traffic Control supervisor at Phuket International Airport, said staff there were laughing at the video.

It merely shows a Boeing 747 leaving a contrail – a trail of condensed water vapor - at around 30,000 feet, he said.

"It's normal," he said. "It's just what happens when the engines heat the cold air... Even my

nephew, five years old, knows about it."

About 50 seconds into the video, the trail disappears. The narrator suggests the aircraft is running out of whatever it is "pumping" into the air.

Mr Nopadol laughed at the idea.

"Nobody would use a jet to spray chemicals. Normally if you want to spray something for agriculture or whatever, you fly 500 to 1,000 feet high," he said.

'This one's much higher. He used the zoom," he added.

While robinhoodlum said the footage showed a plane "with no identifiable marks that flies over the island at hourly intervals from around 6am to 8am to around midday," Mr Nopadol said they were different flights each time. The plane in the footage

was probably a Qantas flight from Europe to Australia, he added.

More than 300 aircraft fly over Phuket every day. Most are long-haul flights from Australia, Singapore and Indonesia to Europe and the Middle East, he said. The video ends with apparent footage of the trail still visible an hour later. Text on the screen claims: "If this was condensation then it would not 'run out'," and, "It would also disappear quite quickly, as the heated air cools and the condensation evaporates."

"Chemtrails. What are they, what's in them, no idea. Does anybody even officially recognize they exist?" asks the narrator.

If Mr Nopadol and his colleagues are anything to go by, clearly not.

Enter the dragon: feng shui

The proposed traffic tunnel beneath Patong Hill is drawing opposition from some unexpected quarters, as some elderly ethnic-Chinese residents of the island believe the project could ruin Phuket's feng shui, bringing economic ruin to Patong and other parts of the island. Pimwara Choksakulpan and Stephen Fein report.

CCORDING to a Chinese legend, Phuket's topography is that of a golden sea dragon emerging from the Indian Ocean. Tradition holds that this dragon, *Hai Leng Ong*, is duty-bound to protect Phuket and its visitors, sustaining life and prosperity in business.

The south-facing dragon's supposed snout is Laem Phromthep, while its heart is in the vicinity of Phuket Town. The Nakkerd Range of hills running up the island's southwest coast makes up part of the dragon's long, curving abdomen that ends in a tail that curls back up over its torso when it sits in a semicoiled position.[*see picture*]

So important to Phuket's history is Hai Leng Ong that a large monument of the whiskered sea dragon sits as the feature attraction at Queen Sirikit Park, near the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) office on Thalang Road in Phuket Town.

An explanation of the importance of 'The Great Sea Dragon of Indian Ocean' [sic] fills the first page of a tourist-oriented booklet currently under distribution by Phuket City Municipality. The island's up-and-coming soccer team, FC Phuket, goes by the name "Southern Sea Kirin" – kirin being the Japanese-language rendering of a legendary Chinese sea creature that also resembles a dragon.

The importance of the sea dragon legend varies from person to person, but there is concern in some quarters that a proposed tunnel beneath Patong Hill connecting tambons Kathu and Patong

could 'slay the dragon', bringing economic ruin to the island.

The proposed tunnel, which enjoys strong support from Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop and Patong Mayor Pian

Keesin, is now the subject of a 40-million-baht study by a Bangkok-based team, which has already made its recommendation on the best possible route.

The route would begin on the Kathu side of Patong Hill near the Go-kart Speedway and emerge on the Patong side east of Phisit Gorani Road, passing over the Ban Mon community via a 200meter elevated roadway. The terminus would be on the new Phang Muang Sai Kor Road, near the APK apartment complex.

Supporters of the project say the tunnel would decrease traffic accidents on the treacherous Phra Barami Road. Opponents in the Ban Mon community say they would have to sell off their land under eminent domain law. They also claim the elevated roadway would pass over Ratchapathanusorn (the National Memorial of His Majesty The King's Footprint) on Phisit Gorani Road, which commemorates HM The King's visit to Patong on March 11, 1959.

of dissent are some members of Phuket's ethnic Chinese community, who oppose the project on spiritual grounds.

Banjong 'Ko Jong' Damklam, 67-year-old manager of the San Chao Phor Suea (Tiger God Chinese Shrine) on top of Patong Hill, said some elderly Chinese residents of Phuket continue to maintain an active belief in the legend of Hai Leng Ong - and fear that the proposed tunnel route would go through the dragon's stomach, killing it.

"They fear the dragon's death will change the feng shui of the island, ruining business on both sides of the hill," he explained.

"Patong Beach faces out to the Andaman Sea, so they fear that if another tsunami happens seawater could pass through the tunnel and inundate Phuket Town," he said.

Mr Banjong said any tunnel work should only proceed after the spirits have been appeased.

"If the people insist on the project, I suggest that before work begins all persons involved in the



a ritual asking for forgiveness. This should make everything run smoothly," he said.

Mr Banjong personally disagrees with the proposed tunnel, but is willing to go along with it if a majority of Phuket residents are in favor, he said.

In its lofty position at the border between tambons Kathu and Patong, San Chao Phor Suea currently gets plenty of "passing trade" in the form of motorists on Phra Barami Road who must pass by it to get from one side of the hill to the other.

Not many of them stop, as the parking area across the street is limited and the dangerous road conditions there are notorious, but many cars still beep their horns three times to show their respect for the hilltop's guardian spirits. At certain times of year the shrine puts on Chinese movies on a makeshift screen in the parking lot, not for passers-by, but to entertain the local hill spirits.

Even if a tunnel does eventually become the favored route between Patong and Kathu, Mr Banjong is not unduly concerned about the number of visitors coming to the shrine, which relies on donations to fund its activities and upkeep.

"I think the tunnel will not affect number of people coming to the shrine. Its location is at the highest point [in the hill pass] and people who worship at this sacred place will not stop coming here," he said.

Local historian and president of the Phuket Community Foundation (PCF), Pranee Sakulpipatana, said she wasn't overly concerned about the legend of *Hai Leng Ong* and the fate of Phuket if the tunnel goes though the proposed route.

"I don't pay much attention to these types of beliefs. I think it is said that Phuket looks like a dragon, because people describe it by their imaginations. Don't be overly interested in this topic," she advised.

The *Gazette* got a similar response from a famous fortuneteller and *feng shui* doctor Ajarn Prasith Jantharasuth, who also hosts a local radio program.


"I have heard many times that people said that tunnel will kill the dragon and break the *feng shui* of Phuket, but I disagree. I think they should study the science of *feng shui* and the shape and dragon in detail first before weighing in on this topic," he said.

Ajarn Prasith said some believe it is the dragon's heart, not the stomach that lies inside Patong Hill.

"I think the tunnel could go under its heart, but I have to study in detail to know exactly where the heart lies and which is the best route for the tunnel to avoid it. I can guarantee there won't be any problems if the tunnel doesn't pass through the dragon's heart," he said.

Plans to bore a tunnel beneath Patong Hill date back decades, to the time when Patong began to change from a pristine fishing village into the bustling seaside resort town it is today.





Smashed in 'Seven' Ravaged capital

UBON RATCHATHANI: Two young men arrested for allegedly being drunk and smashing up a 7-Eleven store told police the attack was motivated by hunger.

Suspects Kasemsan Saiwong, 19, and Sorayut Saithong, 20, said they launched the attack in anger at the store closing early because of the curfew in place in Ubon and other provinces.

The pair, who were arrested in the early hours of May 23, told police they had been drinking all day at a traditional rocket festival.

After getting home, they went out to find some food – but all the shops and restaurants were shut under the curfew imposed by the Centre for Resolution of the Emergency Situation (CRES).

Seeing their own nutritional plight as an emergency situation in need of resolution, they took their anger out on the 7-Eleven, kicking in the shopfront to get at some food.

BANGKOK: City officials and Bangkok residents joined hands on May 23 for a mass clean-up of the ravaged city center.

Bangkok Governor Sukhumbhand Paribatra led more than 2,000 workers and volunteers in a major operation to tidy up sites that saw conflict between protesters and troops before and during the crackdown.

Six locations adjacent to the Rajprasong intersection were cleaned to enable Bangkokians to resume their normal lives on May 24, when schools in the capital started the new semester after a week's delay.

The same day, businesses and state agencies re-opened their offices after a week-long closure.

"We have to forgive what happened in the past and look ahead to rebuild a bright future for Bangkok," Mr Sukhumbhand said.

The Bangkok Metropolitan

Administration was working on a plan to rehabilitate the capital and help the business sector renew tourism, he said.

The authority would host a merit-making ceremony with 1,000 Buddhist monks on Rajadamri Road from Rajprasong to Sala Daeng, where many people died in the protest, he said.

A large amount of rubbish had accumulated at Rajprasong intersection, site of the main rally stage, but workers said they would clean it as soon as possible.

Many volunteers joined the big cleaning day in a spirit of helping the country return to peace and order. Some were not even Bangkok residents, but joined the operation in solidarity.

Social networking websites were integral in spreading word of the clean-up.

"We heard about it on Facebook. Our group actually came here yesterday to take photos and put them on Facebook to encourage our friends to take part in the event," said Rachya Rungsaroj.

Most volunteers brought their own cleaning tools, garbage bags, brooms, trowels and rags. Companies and independent groups gave out water, food and energy drinks to support the volunteers throughout the day.

"I'm not originally from Bangkok. I used to think Bangkok as an urban area where people live separately and have no interaction with others. Now I clearly see the real Thai tradition of helping each other still exists," said Sininart Swadpoon, from Thammasat University.

Even foreigners lent a hand. "My girlfriend heard about the event on Facebook so we decided to help clean and get things back to normal. I was surprised to see how big the mess was," said Chris Garben, an American who joined the clean-up with his Thai girlfriend, Meg Sukjit.

Thai film wins top prize at Cannes

CANNES, FRANCE: For the first time ever, a Thai film on May 23 won the Palme d'Or for Best Picture at the Cannes Film Festival.

Uncle Boonmee Who Can Recall His Past Lives, directed by Apichatpong Weerasethakul, was described as 'lyrically beautiful' and 'often surreal'.

Jury chairman Tim Burton named it best film in competition, seeing off 18 other films from an impressive roster of filmmakers that included Mike Leigh, Ken Loach and Iranian director Abbas Kiarostami.

It is the first Asian Palme d'Or winner since 1997, when Kiarostami shared it with Japanese film maker Shohei Imamura.

The win came after the veteran South Korean director Hong Sangsoo was awarded the prestigious Un Certain Regard sidebar prize for *Hahaha*.


The Asian clean sweep took most Cannes watchers by surprise. Just as surprising was that there were no prizes at all for Loach and Leigh.

Burton said deciding the Palme d'Or had felt like an easy choice. The jury saw the film early and it stayed in their heads throughout the festival, he said.

"The world is getting smaller and more Westernised, more Hollywoodized, and this is a film where I felt I was watching from another country. It was using fantasy elements but in a way I'd never seen before so I just felt it was like a beautiful, strange dream."

Accepting the award, Weerasethakul said, "I would like to thank all the spirits and all the ghosts in Thailand who made it possible for me to be here."

THERE'S a cozy little hangout in Phuket called Bush Pilot Lounge – and it's not on Soi Bangla.

Located at the Phuket Airpark in Pa Khlok, the breezy lounge with views of buffalo and *dok bua* is the hangout of the Phuket Flying Club, a non-profit association of the island's growing number of small and ultralight plane pilots – those who fly for the love of it, not just to get from point A to point B.

Phuket Airpark is similar in many ways to real estate developments that surround golf courses, except that the development's central feature is a grass runway – not a fairway. Owners who buy plots along the runway will be able to land their aircraft on the airstrip and taxi straight into their units, which will come complete with garagelike hangers.

Although still in the early stages of development, Phuket Airpark has come a long way since it opened in January last year. The airstrip, initially a dusty expanse, is now covered with grass. It has also been lengthened and drainage in the seaside area has been improved. The real estate side of the development is just 'getting off the ground' and the area seems to hold great potential for those wanting to set up a niche aviation-related business.

Some interesting possibilities might include a flying school, island tour service, sky diving, banner towing service or air taxi, to name just a few. The only private airstrip on the island, the airpark seems to have little competition – and is perfectly situated for low-flying tours around Phang Nga Bay, like the one immortalized in celluloid by the James Bond film *The Man With The Golden Gun*.

Runway revisited Phuket Airpark stirs passions for tiny engines

Phuket Airpark Managing Director Suchard Raksangob showed me around the flying club's main hanger, which at the time housed a four-seat Cessna, a small amphibious plane, a tiny 'experimental' aircraft and the Phuket Flying Club's first aircraft, a Canadian-built Zenair CH701 jointly owned by five club members.

Offered a ride in the twoseater, I was a bit nervous about

taking to the skies in something not much bigger than a sea kayak. However my nerves settled after meeting my pilot, former THAI airways pilot and Phuket Flying Club President Capt Watana Thinphanga.

Capt Watana flew some of the world's largest commercial aircraft in his 33 years with THAI and retired with a perfect safety record. Perhaps Thailand's answer to Capt Sully, he now flies ultralights as a hobby, sometimes doing aerobatics and helping out in good causes, like teaming up with marine biologists to try and count the local dugong population.

With their bird's eye view, the Phuket Flying Club also keeps lookout for possible land encroachment cases, Capt Watana said

Confident in my pilot, I felt at ease as we taxied out and prepared for takeoff.

Flying over Phuket in an ultralight is a fantastic experience; highly recommended. At about 90 miles per hour and flying at altitudes of 300 to 500 feet, the aircraft offers excellent views and is a dream come true for anyone

interested in aerial photography. We started by flying over the new *Gazette* offices in Koh Kaew, then through the pass at Patong Hill then over Patong, where we circled a few times.

From there it was south along Karon, then low through a pass in the Nakkerd Hills in Kata, being careful to stay below the Big Buddha image. After that we flew south of the island, catching a view of the spectacular Laem Phromthep from the sea side.

With my camera memory card full after flying over Rawai, Laem Panwa, Saphan Hin, Rassada and Koh Sireh, Capt Watana told me it was my turn to take over the controls.

Although he remained in control of the rudder and throttle, I got to experience part of what it feels like to control the pitch, roll and yaw with a joystick. After a little practice he encouraged me to take it in for the landing, which was successfully accomplished on the second attempt.

I was still high from my first taste of flying as we discussed the aviation potential in Phuket over coffee at the Bush Pilot Lounge, which has an interesting collection of old or antique flightrelated items as well as a WWIIera Ford passenger car.

I was surprised to learn that flying, while not cheap, is also not the 'rich man's game' many assume it to be. For a start, a new ultralight like the Zenair CH701 sells for about two-million baht, well less than many luxury cars.

The Zenair's tiny engine, which is no louder than that of a car, runs on normal 95 unleaded gasoline and gets great 'gas mileage'. It is actually much cheaper to operate on a per-kilometer basis than a ride in a Phuket tuk-tuk. Our 50minute flight only burned up about 500 baht's worth, Capt Watana said.

On top of this, airport landing fees are ridiculously cheap for the accurately-named ultralights. The fees are 'weight-based' for commercial aircraft, so after a 20-minute ride to Krabi or 50-minute ride to Trang you can land in either of the airports there for under 100 baht.

To make costs even more affordable, the Phuket Flying Club is looking to acquire four more small aircraft, like Pipers or Cessnas, on a shared basis or under sponsorship.

Currently with some 20 members, the non-profit club welcomes anyone interested in flying. Several expat aviation enthusiasts and high-ranking police officers are among the current members.

An added bonus for new members is that an ultralight pilot licence only requires 20 hours of flying time.

Members meet at the Bush Pilot Lounge for a happy hour on the afternoons of the third Thursday of the month. Stop by to learn more and join them in enjoying some cold 'pilots fuel', also known as 'beer'.

T'S BEEN a good week for Thai cinema and the weeks ahead look promising too.

A Thai drama about a monkey ghost with glowing red eyes, an uncle who is dying of kidney disease and a princess having sex with a talking catfish won the Palme d'Or at the Cannes Film Festival on May 23 (*see page 6*).

Apichatpong Weerasethakul's film *Uncle Boonmee Who Can Recall His Past Lives* scooped top honors at arguably the world's most prestigious film event, at a time when Thailand is making headlines for all the wrong reasons. Plaudits for Apichatpong have been raining in since the win. From the culture minister to man on the street, Thais seeing Thais win big at a major film festival will undoubtedly invigorate the film industry on home turf.

While the Thai film industry basks in Cannes glory, film buffs on Phuket can look forward to seeing more Thai flicks at the Phuket Film Festival from June 4 to 13. Over 30 feature and short films from 11 countries will be screened at various locations around the island.

The majority of films will be screened in their native language and accompanied by English subtitles. The main screening venue will be the Coliseum Cineplex in Phuket Town, where a smattering of 'Meet the Director' receptions are due to take place.

Academy Award nominated director Gus Van Sant was

scheduled to attend the 10-day event, according to festival director Scott Rosenberg, but has since canceled his Phuket visit.

On opening night, ticket holders are invited to a 'networking night' with filmmakers and actors at the Royal Phuket Marina. The following day, Hollywood movie *The Prince and Me 4: The Elephant Adventure*, which was filmed in Thailand, will make its Thai premier at the Green Man Pub in Rawai, followed by a live performance from rap group Thaithanium, whose lead singer stars in the film.

On June 8, Cape Yamu will set the scene for a screening of Darnell Martin's *Cadillac Records*. The Golden Globe nominated director will attend and be on call to speak with ticket holders.

Thai film *Bitter Sweet* will be screened at the Vijit resort in Rawai on June 11, with actresses Mamee Napakprapa Nakprasit and Viyada Umarin in attendance.

Grisly futuristic action thriller *Repomen* starring Jude Law and Forest Whitaker is pencilled in to make its Thai premier on June 12.

"This will be the only chance to watch *Repomen* in Thailand. It is not due to be released in cinemas in the Kingdom," said Mr Rosenberg.

Closing night is set to be an action-packed affair, with the world premier of acclaimed Thai director Yuthlert Sippapak's *Friday Killer* at Kargo restaurant near the Laguna resort complex in Cherng Talay. The first in a trilogy, the film marks a return to the hitman genre for Sippapak.

Other films to look out for include the premier of Adrian Granier's documentary *Teenage Paparazzo*, the Vietnamese action thriller *Bai Rong* (Clash) and the Australian comedy *Bran Nue Dae*, to name a few.

The festival is sponsored






URING the 17th century, Siamese kings were quite tolerant of foreigners and the kingdom was opened to foreign trade and commercial relations with the West. Muslim merchants from Persia traded heavily in Siam throughout the 16th and 17th centuries AD. During the reign of King Songtham, a prominent Persian scholar known as Sheikh Ahmad of Qom traveled to Ayudhaya.

As Ayudhaya's Persian trading community grew, Sheikh Ahmad managed to gain royal favor with King Songtham and became a courtier. With his knowledge of commerce, he was allowed to manage Siam's foreign trade.

The Persian community in Ayudhaya had become important for Siam's trade, and yet it was without representation at court. Seeing the need for an adviser on Persian-Islamic affairs, King Songtham created a new office known as the "Chularajmontri" and appointed Sheikh Ahmad as the first holder of the title.

Being a learned Muslim scholar, Ahmad was able to advise the king on matters concerning Islam and Persian traditions in the capital. Persians in the kingdom referred to Ahmad as "Sheikh-ul-Islam". From then on the Chularajmontri has been recognized as the leading authority on Islam in the Thai kingdom. The office still exists today and holders are directly appointed by the king, and remain the Chularajmontri for life.

During the reign of King Narai, towards the latter half of the 17th century, Persian influence reached its peak in the

royal court of Ayudhaya. King Narai was very open-minded towards foreign knowledge and religious beliefs. He welcomed trade from Western powers, giving the Dutch and Persians in particular much liberty in trading within Siam.

It is said that during King Narai's reign many Persians were appointed to high-ranking offices in the capital. There are also records that tell of several Muslim governors being appointed to rule trading towns.

One of the most influential figures in the Siamese court during this period was a Persian named Aqa Muhammad Astarabadi, who arrived in Siam in 1650 AD. Already well in favor with Narai even before he became king, Aqa Muhammad became one of the king's closest advisers.

With Aqa Muhammad's help, the court built strong relations with Muslim-ruled ports in India and the Middle East, fostering trade and increasing revenue. Being able traders and experienced mariners, the Persians were placed in command of virtually the whole Siamese trading fleet.

Aqa Muhammad was so trusted by the king that he was even allowed to reform the king's personal company of bodyguards, replacing them with 200 professional soldiers from India.

Under Aqa Muhammad's influence, many Indians and Persians were appointed governors of important Siamese trading towns, and in 1676 Aqa Muhammad asked King Narai to replace the Siamese governor of Phuket with two Moorish Muslim brothers, Muhammad Beg and Isma'il Beg, both Aqa Muhammad's associates.

Phuket was a major source of tin in the region and the Dutch had been trading tin on the island under Siamese governor Okphra Phet. After a quarrel between Dutch traders and Governor

Okphra Phet, the Dutch were chased off the island and as a result lost control of one of the most important tin-producing ports on Thailand's Andaman coast.

The begrudging Dutch appealed to Aqa Muhammad to have Okphra Phet removed from office. Aqa Muhammad obliged and convinced the king to remove Okphra Phet despite a tenacious fight to retain his position.

According to Capt Thomas Bowrey, an English merchant and chronicler who visited Phuket during the time, King Narai had said he wanted a sterner man who would be more suitable to govern Phuket and its tin trade. Muhammad and Isma'il Beg were therefore appointed Joint-Governors of Phuket.

However, Bowrey also noted that Phuket people resented the foreign governors. Under Persian influence many of the offices that used to be held by Siamese officials, such as counselors and secretariats, had been filled by Persians and Indians with connections to either the Beg brothers or Aqa Muhammad.

With many high-ranking positions in Phuket being held by foreigners who spoke a different language and followed different cultural practices, the locals neither trusted their superiors, nor believed their interests were being looked after. Both the Malay and Siamese inhabitants of Phuket loathed the new governors and felt tyrannized.

Hatred towards the foreigners boiled over when the governors tried to divert all of Phuket's tin exports to Mergui, a Siamese port governed by an Indian Muslim.

Muhammad Beg wanted to secure Phuket's tin reserves exclusively for Indian traders, who could buy them from Mergui and ship them to Indian- and Persiancontrolled ports.

This policy was strongly resented by Phuket locals, most of who mined tin for a living and sold it to the highest bidder, regardless of origin.

Enraged, Phuket locals massacred about 80 Indian officials on the island at that time, including the Beg brothers, ending the relatively short Moorish governorship of the island.

A few years later, Persian influence started to decline in the capital. Aqa Muhammad died in 1680 and his position as the king's favorite was filled by yet another foreigner: Constantine Phaulkon.

After Aqa Muhammad's death, Persian influence was no longer guaranteed at the court of Ayudhaya and it began to decline throughout the kingdom, making way for a new era of European influence at the court of Ayudhaya.

EXPAT GALLERY John Gray

JOHN Gray has led a most remarkable life. He is well known on Phuket for introducing sea kayaking in Phang Nga Bay 20 years ago. He was the first person to offer day trips into the remote caves which had been the exclusive domain of valuable birds' nests.

"I had been operating seakayaking trips in Hawaii during the mid-1980s and was always interested in exploring Thailand. I researched the local limestone caves for four years and developed tidal technology to determine when the caves were accessible."

Although John was the first to offer the opportunity to explore these hidden caves, he was soon met with a lot of local competition, but he has managed to stay ahead of it due to the quality and innovative focus of his environmentally friendly tours.

He is in great demand as a speaker and trainer representing the Andaman region at conferences aimed at improving ecofriendly tourism.

John has had a love of the sea since he was born.

"I started swimming in the Pacific Ocean when I was six months old, long before I could walk. I love body surfing and have ridden the biggest waves in the world, including Waimea Bay in Hawaii and The Wedge at Newport Beach."

He was a talented student and born environmentalist. His parents were avid members of the outdoor Sierra Club. At his home, the family offered a drop house for injured birds for the Audubon Society, including birds of prey.

John was elected President of his high school business club, Junior Achievement. In an annual competition sponsored by the New York Stock Exchange, he was given the top achievement award on the floor of the NYSE.

He moved to Hawaii in 1970 where he spent much of the next 20 years before coming to Phuket. He worked as a writer and publicist before becoming the Marketing Director for the United Way, and then the Pacific Basin Communications Director for the National Cancer Institute.

"This is when I developed my interest in medical research. I believe that heart disease, diabetes, obesity and cancer are the price people pay for eating their 'relatives'. I have not had any red meat since 1980."

On a scholarship, John graduated from UCLA with a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science and International Relations, while on a three-year break from his life in Hawaii. In 1982, he became "Gentleman John", an announcer for wrestling events around the Pacific Basin, including Samoa, Tonga and Tahiti.

He was the Associated Press correspondent for the South Pacific Games held in 1983 in Samoa, and during that stint was appointed Minister of Communications for the government of Western Samoa.

But he decided to return to Hawaii and develop his seakayaking business taking adventure tourists to remote islands where they could experience his love of local, pristine nature. He particularly liked the island of Moloka'i and began making documentaries about the beauty of the tropical environment.


He went to Fiji and did a film about Halley's Comet, and his film *Moloka'i's Forgotten Frontier* won top awards for a nature documentary.

"By 1989, I was ready for a new adventure. I decided to move to Asia to become an environmental activist."

Running his business has not always been easy for John as he refuses to compromise his service standards to make more money.

But John has survived and even thrived on the many challenges by doing things his own way, which he believes supports both the local eco-tourism industry and the long term health of Phang Nga Bay.

Firefly confident in Phuket with new promotions launch

N a show of confidence in tourism to Phuket, and to Thailand in general, Firefly Airlines on May 25 launched a host of new destination travel packages and a brace of promotional campaigns, including the ability to book tickets through mobile phones.

Angelina Fernandez, Firefly's Head of Marketing & Communications, told a press conference at The Metropole hotel in Phuket Town, "Yes, we are very confident, because of your [Thailand's] products and I don't think Phuket has been affected at all."

She explained that Firefly will maintain its current flight schedule of four flights a week each way between Penang and Phuket, and from October 31 will start operating daily flights to Samui.

"That tells you how confident we are about Thailand," she added. Ms Fernandez said that the load factor, or the number of seats occupied on each flight, currently stands at 65 percent to 70 percent. "We have no directional problems: the number of all leisure travelers and holidaymakers flying from Phuket to Penang compared with those flying from Penang to Phuket is very balanced," she explained.

The new packages, launched under the pre-existing Firefly Holiday campaign, saw the airline greatly expand its range of destinations through more integration with its parent company, Malaysia Airlines (MAS).

To mark the launch, Ms Fernandez announced Firefly is offering round-trip flights from Phuket to Penang for 3,560 baht, and further abroad to Melbourne, via a stopover in Kuala Lumpur, for 33,350 baht, all airport taxes and surcharges included.

Customized packages to cater to wedding trips, adventure holidays or romantic getaways, for example, were also available on Firefly's website, she added.

From a Phuket perspective, the new packages seem pitched directly at tourists already in Phuket to make a value-add trip to Penang to add to their holiday as well as foreigners in Phuket looking for a getaway or needing to make a visa run.

On whether Firefly were looking to expand their own services, she said, "We simply do not have any more aircraft... We have just completed Phase I of our expansion with seven aircraft and all aircraft are fully utilized. "We will embark on Phase

II when the board of directors and the management of Malaysia Airlines plans to have new aircraft." She added that Firefly currently directly serves eight domestic and 10 regional destinations.

The new packages are also available through Firefly's new mobile phone booking service, also launched on May 25. People can now book from literally anywhere, anytime, said Ms Fernandez.

She added that the facility accepts payment by credit card and also allows people to book and pay for tickets for other people.

To mark the launch of the new service, Ms Fernandez announced that Firefly is now offering a promotional one-way ticket between Phuket and Penang for RM1 (one ringgit, about 12 baht),

Tourist arrivals up 41%, says AoT

HILE the red shirt protests and government crackdown in the Thai capital saw international passenger arrivals to Bangkok airports fall by 0.6% last month, the number of international arrivals to Phuket in April increased by 41.4%, according to Airports of Thailand (AoT) statistics released by CB Richard Ellis on May 26.

International arrivals to Suvarnabhumi Airport last month fell by 0.6% to 1,184,241 compared with 1,190,820 in April 2009, said the report. The drop represented a 14.9% decrease from April 2008 figures.

However, international arrivals to Phuket International Airport continued to improve despite increasing political tensions in Bangkok.

The total number of international passenger arrivals at Phuket Airport was 120,015 compared with 84,871 in April 2009 a 41.1% increase.


The total number of domestic passenger arrivals at Phuket Airport also rose, only slightly, from 146,088 in April this year compared with 145,209 in April 2009.

"The April figures were very encouraging taking into account Bangkok's escalating political protests and the closure of many European airports due to volcanic ash," said James Pitchon, Executive Director at CB Richard Ellis Thailand.

agency for PP(SEA)CL.







Only red lights at the end of the tunnel

Public debate has intensified in recent weeks as road projects that have been talked about for years appear closer to becoming reality in Phuket.

Despite the recent chaos in Bangkok, the number of tourists visiting the island continues to grow. Airports of Thailand (AoT) reported over 120,000 international arrivals at Phuket Airport in April 2010, a 41% increase year-on-year. AoT expects this trend to continue, as evidenced by its Bt5.7bn expansion plan to double passenger capacity there to 12.5 million by 2013.

With ever more people coming here, passenger car sales remain brisk. Sales increases of around 40% year-on-year have been reported by many dealerships for the first quarter of 2010. The increase has been buoyed by sales to foreigners, who account for up to half of all sales at some dealerships, as well as Phuket's welldocumented lack of reasonably priced public transport.

Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop has worked hard at improving the island's road network, coming out in support of a plan to bore a pair of tunnels beneath Patong Hill to facilitate transport between Patong and Kathu.

The Gazette does not necessarily oppose the tunnel, but continues to insist that the only long-term solution to the traffic problem in Patong will have to include a drastic reduction in the number of taxis and tuk-tuks, introduction of a bus or songthaew system, improved drainage and expanded public parking.

Another key issue is poorly regulated developments in the few areas not already covered in concrete, including along Phang Muang Sai Kor Road and along Phra Barami Road, where property values could soar if the tunnel becomes a reality - a fact not lost on the project's supporters. As monsoon conditions intensify in coming months, it will be interesting to see just how effective the municipality's efforts to combat chronic flooding problems in several areas will be.

Along the bypass road, there are plans to ease traffic congestion at the Samkong and Darasamuth School intersections by building underpasses and one flyover. Much like the situation in Patong, these measures will do little to ease congestion in the real trouble spot - where Chao Fa West Road narrows just south of Wichit Songkram School and remains constricted all the way to the Phuket Software Park intersection.

While there will be some benefit to east-west traffic, all the underpass is likely to achieve on this stretch of the bypass road is to get motorists to the bottleneck more quickly. Once again the only credible solution is one that encourages people to leave their car at home – or not buy one in the first place.

Grand plans for Phuket Airport





Prateung Sornkham has been director of Phuket International Airport for just over a year. The 56-yearold Chiang Mai native earned a master's degree from the Faculty of Economics at Chiang Mai University before joining Airports of Thailand (AoT). He has been with AoT for almost 22 years and served as the director

of Chiang Rai Airport for three years before coming to Phuket. Mr Prateung talks with the Gazette about expansion plans and the role of AoT and Phuket International Airport (PIA) on the island.

side from Suvarnabhumi Airport in Bangkok, Phuket International Airport is able to handle the largest number of passengers in Thailand with about 25,000 passengers a day and 6.5 million a year. We can handle these numbers now, but our forecasting predicts more and more passengers each year.

We now have a 5.7-billionbaht budget for our expansion plan. The project is in the design stage and construction is set to begin this year. We hope to have everything finished by 2013.

The plan is to make the current airport building our domestic terminal and to build an international terminal with a corridor linking the two. We will construct six more gates, giving us a total of 21, meaning we will be able to handle 21 flights an hour. We're also going to build a five-story parking garage to hold 1,000 vehicles. Right now we can only accommodate 300.

Once everything is finished, the new airport will be able to handle up to 12.5 million passengers a year. That's almost twice the capacity we have now.

There are only a few airports in the world that are as close to the ocean as Phuket International. This makes maintenance of our buildings and equipment more difficult because of damage from salt from the ocean. We have to repair and replace things more often than other airports,

which makes maintenance costs quite high.

For example, each runway light costs 40,000 baht. Think about how many of those we have on one runway. At an airport further from the sea, these bulbs can last for over 10 years, but here we have to replace them every few years. And that's only light bulbs. What about everything else?

That said, I am not worried about running the airport, as I know how to fix almost all of the problems. But remember that AoT works according to government procedure which means that every single budget request we make needs to be approved. This can take quite a long time, and most of the time the response is not as fast as we would like.

I am quite happy with our 220 permanent staff members and around 300 outsourced staff who help each other in taking care of the airport and passengers. I am pleased with the quality of service we provide.

We do sometimes receive complaints about our airport, but that is normal because nothing in the world is perfect and we accept that. We listen to every concern so that we can make plans to improve. Most people understand and support AoT, especially Phuket businesses and locals, and I really appreciate that.

Regarding the situation in Bangkok, I really want to confirm to all tourists that our security is well prepared and the airport is taxi concession fees [Phuket

safe. Phuket is quite lucky as it rarely has conflict and people don't fight that much. I would like all people in Phuket to help and tell tourists that it is safe here.

One way to look at it is like Phuket being the Hong Kong of Thailand and Bangkok being like mainland China; Phuket is an island, far away from the troubles of Bangkok, so we are safe and are always able to welcome tourists.

A big issue for AoT is the

I would like people to be more open minded and try to understand our point of view. The fact is that we only get 700 baht per passenger in airport taxes. I want people to think of the airport as belonging to everyone and to help each other take care of it because it is good for Phuket. As long as tourists are coming, we can all benefit together.

Phuket is a good place to do business and make money, but when I retire I don't think I will stay here. I plan to go back and live in Chiang Rai.

The price for the two tickets should only be 80 baht. We do give them a commission, so if they are charging more than 80 baht you can tell the police in your area or call to complain at 1466 or 02-345-1466.

Rising Thai stars to play Merc Masters at Laguna

OME of Thailand's best young golfers will be in Phuket this week, vying for the top prize of US\$9,750 in the Mercedes-Benz Masters Thailand to be played at the Laguna Phuket Golf Club from June 2-5.

The Mercedes-Benz Masters Thailand was last played in 2008 when it was the season-ending Tour Championship. Malaysian Danny Chia took the title. The US\$60,000 Laguna tournament will be the fourth event of this year's 10-leg circuit.

Leading the charge for Thailand among the full-field of 144 players will be Thanyakon Khrongpha, who won the third leg of the tour, the Kariza Indonesia Championship, held in Jakarta May 5-8.


Thanyakon, 20, won by holing a 12-foot birdie putt on the par-5 18th hole – the first play-off hole - to leave Jay Bayron from the Philippines in second place for the third successive Mercedes-Benz Tour event.

The Thai golfer turned professional only in January, but stormed through on the final day with a six-under-par 66.

"There was no way I thought I would win this week. Playing with the professionals is such a different game. I was very nervous today especially on the front nine," said Thanyakon.

He started the day four shots behind the leader Juvic Pagunsan from the Philippines. A bogey on the fourth hole suggested it wasn't going to be his day but then he caught fire and made seven birdies, including five on the back nine.

He also birdied the 18th in regulation play while Bayron, playing in the group behind him, holed a brave par putt on the last

from 10 feet to draw level.

Thanyakon's victory in his rookie season will perhaps not surprise many because last year he enjoyed a stellar season on the amateur circuit winning the Malaysian and Thailand Amateur Championships.

He also helped Thailand win the gold medal in the team event in the SEA Games, where he took the bronze individually.

However, Thanyakon will be keeping a close eye on fellow Thai Udorn Duangdecha, who won the second leg of the tour, the Singha Pattaya Open, held April 29 to May 2.

Chasing Thanyakon and Udorn's accolades will be Wisut Artjanawat, last year's winner of

the season-opening Mercedes-Benz Masters Philippines, and compatriot Namchok Tantipokhakul, winner of last year's Order of Merit title.

Namchok won twice on the Mercedes-Benz Tour last year and recently became the first player to benefit from a new opportunity whereby seven players from the Mercedes-Benz Tour earn berths in this year's Barclays Singapore Open.

The course to be played on at Laguna is an 18-hole, par-71 course designed by Max Wexler and David Abell.

For the Mercedes-Benz Masters Thailand the course will be par-70.



Phuket gold at BIS swim meet

IANCA Goetz of the Brit-ish International School Flying Fish swim team and former BIS pupil Gavin Lewis, now a swimming coach for the Phuket International Academy (PIA) Silverfinz, both scored gold medals at the second Flying Fish Invitational Swim Meet held at BIS last weekend.

The meet attracted 340 children from throughout Asia. Students from as far afield as China and the Philippines were joined by a large contingent of local swimmers. Representing Phuket were the Phuket International Academy Silverfinz, the Phuket Country Home Swim Club, the Phuket Swimming Club as well as 70-student-strong BIS Flying Fish team.

The Flying Fish finished second in the overall team rankings for the meet with 1,139 points, behind team winners Orchid Country Club, who amassed 1,549 points.

Orchid Country Club also dominated the medal tally, winning 34 gold, 19 silver and 13 bronze medals, ahead of the Flying Fish again in second place with 11 gold, 10 silver and nine bronze medals.

"I was really pleased to beat my personal best, before it was 52 seconds, but today I did it in 50 seconds. I think I was faster because all the Flying Fish were cheering for me. We came sec-

Any hopes of a fight back by an exhausted Hong Kong FC were swiftly dispelled when Singapore CC scored a decisive third goal in the dying seconds. Jon Duffy played an intelligent through-ball and Jim Redfern poked the ball past the onrushing keeper and into the empty net to give Singapore CC an unassailable 3-1 lead.

Peter Schott, an old friend of Lorenz, said that divine intervention may have played a part





Centara's Bt 1.9bn project on the up



PLUNGING occupancy rates throughout Thailand has not affected the Centara Hotels & Resorts' plan to open their latest Phuket resort in November this year, just in time for the start of the next high season.

Guests staying in the villas, pool suites and pool premium rooms will enjoy the hotel's club privileges, which includes access to the resort's Private Club Lounge with 200 square meters of indoor and outdoor terrace and five complimentary meal servings per day.

Leisure facilities will include four swimming pools, a tennis court, a water-sports center, a 144sqm fitness center and the Cenvaree spa, with 10 single and double treatment rooms. According to Khun Kanokros, several corporate bookings have been made already at the resort for later in year.

In keeping with the groups' family-friendly ethos, the new resort will offer a range of services for children, including children's swimming pools, a children's playground and two playrooms, one fitted out to entertain children between four and 10 years old and another to cater to 10-to 16-year-olds.


Dining and entertainment at

the resort will consist of Italian, Mediterranean and Asian tapas style food.

Bars will include the Beachcomber Beach Bar, a Splash Pool Bar and the sea view Lobby Lounge & Bar featuring live piano music in the evenings.



NE of Phuket's oldest higher education institutions, Phuket Rajabhat University, is currently undergoing a huge upgrade, with six new buildings under construction in a project with a total budget of 395 million baht.

Located in Rassada on the north side of Phuket Town, the establishment was first named the Phuket Rajabhat Institute in 1971, but was elevated to university status in 2004 and renamed Phuket Rajabhat University. Thirty years ago, the institution had about 100 teachers and only a few buildings. Today, staff numbers have grown to more than 200 teachers supported by a further 200 staff. All working in more than 40 buildings.

The expansion project of five new faculty buildings and a new auditorium aims to accommodate the needs of the growing number of students and staff on campus, which occupies more than 354 rai.

The project is situated on

11 rai dedicated expressly for the new buildings, not including the new auditorium. Construction of the auditorium is almost complete, with workers now fitting the decor.

The venue, which can seat 2,200 people for a single function, is slated to be open by the year's end.

Construction work on the entire project began four years ago and is scheduled to be completed by early 2012. Of the new buildings, the new main building stands nine stories high and has an interior area of 10,000sqm. The building, now in its final stage of completion, can house about 3,000 students at any one time.

Four other three or four story high buildings are also under construction and due to be completed by 2012: a Language and Computer Center, Industrial Technology Building, Health Education Building and Science Education Building.

Taking time puccino out from the media glare

OR much of this year, Thailand has been in the harsh, bright light of the media. Instant images showing all sorts of mayhem have been beamed on TV around the world, posted on news websites, blogs and YouTube, delighting thrill junkies everywhere.

Anyone who has ever checked into a luxury hotel, gone into their spacious bathroom and looked at themselves closely in one of those cosmetic mirrors bordered by blinding lights can vouch that under harsh scrutiny every single flaw and imperfection is magnified into ugly clarity.

While money has been set aside for promotions, advertising and all manner of glitz and glamor to revitalize the ailing tourism sector; there exists serious damage to 'brand Thailand'.

Enter crisis management. Base cases in crisis management range from disasters such as Tiger Woods' affair unraveling to the well-handled David Letterman extortion plot, which he overcame very openly in spite of having affairs with his own staff.

Here in Thailand, the United Front for Democracy Against Dictatorship (UDD) storming Chulaongkorn Hospital may have been a turning point for the entire country, if the incident sparked an intense media outcry. But it didn't.

A few months ago, many people in Phuket thought the island could somehow distance itself from the politically charged area of Bangkok. Tourism could continue to thrive and business would go on as usual. How very wrong the optimists were.

Once the travel warnings were upgraded to include the entire country, the bottom fell out of hotel bookings and on an island that relies on tourism, this is serious business - or lack thereof.

We can always point to the likes of Cebu, in the Philippines, whose patrons worked hard to separate their identity from the post-Marcos turmoil in the late '80s.

Likewise for Bali. When riots broke out in Jakarta and strongman Suharto fell, the island worked hard to put on a brave face to show the world.

Three degrees of separation may work for the Kevin Bacon school of a connected universe, but severing the umbilical cord between tumultuous Bangkok and the peaceful remainder of the Kingdom looks to be an Everestsized challenge.

Luckily for Phuket, there are several efficient, creative, top-shelf professionals who have been working their mojo in Phuket's hotel and property sectors for years.

Bangkok's Mark Arsmden and David Johnson of Delivering Asia Communications have continued to build extensive credentials and kudos, including their high-profile work with Raimon Land.

Phuket itself features AC Counsel, led by Alastair Carthew, who honed his skills working with the Star Alliance international airline program. Infinity Communications' Chanut Nawnarong has starred with key product and

Regional imports have always figured into the mix with Singapore's Lee Sutton, who handled the recent glitzy Andara launch for Allan Zeman, and over in Hong Kong is Susan Field's Impact Asia.

There remains little doubt at the moment that all the promo baht in the world may be better spent being flushed into a bottomless pit, but at the same time setting up a long-term proactive communications plan has never been more relevant to businesses that rely on a steady stream of travelers.

Crisis planning is today becoming a near-daily event and, frankly speaking, my heart starts to beat just a little faster on these mornings when I make an early start to the day and download the news, be it 'tragic' or 'panic' news, or even on those seemingly less frequent quiet days.

I miss the sound of silence, but for tourism and commerce in Phuket the reality remains that positive PR is looking to play a pivotal role in the days and months ahead. Those who have been to rehab know they remain odds-on favorites for relapses, and for those who can't afford a permanent suite at a Betty Ford Clinic, perhaps retaining a PR firm may be the next best thing.

Branching out to ornamental gardens

• OME trees in Phuket impose their presence on the observer only when they burst into flower, usually in the dry season. One such tree is the tabebuia.

This tree is widely used in hot weather gardens and is a member of the Bignoniaciae family, which includes the Tecoma stans or yellow trumpet tree, which it superficially resembles.

Tabebuia blooms in pink or yellow, but produces its clusters of dramatic chrome-yellow flowers only after it has shed its leaves. The result is a stunning display of unalloyed blossom.

These trees can be seen dotted around the island, all displaying their blooms in the current dry weather. They may be a bit large for the average garden, but they are oh so pretty.

The same is true of the Delonix regia, or poinciana or hang nok yoong in Thai, sometimes given the highly descriptive name of flamboyant or flame tree. If one ornamental tree epitomizes the tropics, it is the poinciana.

Like the tabebuia, its brilliant, scarlet blooms ignite the Phuket landscape in April. Similar to the tabebuia, the flame tree's five-petaled flowers appear only after it sheds its fernlike leaves. Delonix regia has a distinctive umbrella shape, but it will need space. Nonetheless, the flame tree is relatively easy to grow, enjoys hot conditions and does particularly well in the dual seasonal climate of Phuket.

Flame tree saplings usually sprout around the roots of mature specimens. As the tree is a member of the Leguminosae family, these germinate from large black seed pods, and offer a way of saving a few baht for some new trees.

Another ornamental tree

are most commonly seen with purple flowers. Below left: A Hong Kong Orchid tree's alluring pink flowers, a vermillion orange Royal Poinciana and a picturesque pink Tabebuia.

that enjoys seasonal change and full sun is the bauhinia.

Coming from the same genus of Leguminosae as the flame tree, the bauhinia exists in many varieties, including a dwarf form. Almost all have characteristic twin-lobed leaves and widely spaced, delicate, five-petaled flowers.

The varieties most likely to be found in nurseries in Phuket are Bauhinia variegata, also called mountain ebony or sieo dok khao, which has white, pinkveined or lavender blooms, and the Bauhinia blakeana, commonly known as the Hong Kong orchid tree, whose purple flowers bear more than a passing resemblance to, well, orchids. If a bauhinia becomes a bit straggly, it can be pruned into a neater shape. Moreover, most have a sweet smell.

Talking of perfume, Cananga odorata also grows in Phuket. Although they look more like "shrubs" when they are only two meters tall, they can grow into substantial trees, even if sprouted from a hardwood cutting.

Also known as ylang ylang, or kratang ga yai, the plant has distinctive narrow, yellow flowers that hang claw-like from the ends of evergreen twigs. It also has smooth gray bark and grows in a pendulous form, but is probably best known for its unique

perfume much used in commercial fragrances.


In this regard, the ylang ylang rivals the Michelia champaca, or champaa or champoo, a member of the magnolia family whose buds are used in traditional Thai garlands.

Another specimen to con-

sider is the champaca and its glossy light green leaves and flowers that shade from cream to apricot. It is much venerated by Thais, who grow it as an ornamental plant and believe it brings good luck.

The flowers are long lasting and profoundly fragrant. Also, once established, the tree will survive any number of dry days. A must for a Thai garden.
