Tougher building regulations now in force

PHUKET Natural Resources and Environmental officer Natthaporn Jarunkiatkhajorn has confirmed that tighter controls on building on hillside land in Phuket came into force on July 31, some two months earlier than expected.

"After we receive an official letter from the Department of Natural Resources and Environment Policy and Planning Division in Bangkok, we will immediately send letters informing related organizations to recognize the new regulations," Ms Natthaporn said.

The new regulations, gazetted on July 30 and brought into effect July 31, impose tougher measures aimed at constraining hillside development and ensuring that all new developments have at least the minimum mandated "green areas" reserved with no structures built upon them.

"Construction projects now must follow the new regulations. However, the new rules will not affect applications that have already been submitted and are currently being processed," Ms Natthaporn said, adding that her office receives about 30 building applications each month.

The new rules allow structures be built on gradients of up 50%,

New bridge mars local village life

RESIDENTS living in Tah Chat Chai at the northernmost tip of Phuket have been hit hard by the roadwork and construction of the new bridge off the island.

Their storm drains have been filled in by earthworks, causing their village to flood every time another rainy season deluge befalls them, and the recent redirection of northbound traffic over Thepkrasattri Bridge has left their businesses floundering.

Engineers and construction crews have been going gangbusters on the project, nicknamed by workers as "Sarasin Bridge 2". The project is now 44.2% complete – 13.28% ahead of schedule.

The bridge will span 655 meters, with an additional 1.7 kilometers of newly paved road stretching 560m on the Phuket side and 510m on the Phang Nga side. The two-lane, northbound and southbound roads will provide access to the new bridge.

Construction started July 1 last year and is scheduled to be complete by June 20, 2011, at a precise budget of 377,999,217.10 baht.

completing the project is a rider in the contract imposing a late fine of 113,400 baht for each day construction continues past the June 20 deadline.

Patong Hill claims another

POLICE are trying to learn the identity of a Caucasian man killed in a motorcycle accident on Phuket's notorious Patong Hill road in the early hours of Sunday, August 1.

Kathu Police Duty Officer Nitikorn Rawang received a report of the accident at 4am the same day. Together with Kusoldharm Foundation workers he rushed to the scene at Kuan Yang curve on Phra Barami Rd, where they found the body of a Caucasian man with severe head injuries.

Lying nearby were two injured Thai men, one of whom was later identified as Tossaphol Muangdee,

Mr Tossaphol was rushed to Patong Hospital. The other Thai man, whose name was not reported, was taken to Vachira Phuket Hospital in Phuket Town.

A Yamaha Fino presumably operated by the deceased and Mr Tossaphol's Honda Click were found badly damaged at the scene.

No helmets were found.

Kusoldharm Foundation rescue worker "Aod", who responded to the emergency call, said the curve is well known for traffic accidents. It is also well known that many motorists beep their horns three times for good luck when passing the Chinese shrine at the top of the hill.

Any person with information that may lead to identifying the deceased is asked to call Kathu Police at 076-342719/21.

Police raid nets 42 punters at cockfight

A RAID by Crime Suppression Division Area 5 officers saw 42 people arrested and charged with gambling at a cockpit in Rawai on August 1.

The raid, led by Inspector Sitthikiat Srichan, came at 1:30pm at a rubber plantation area off Soi Suanwat, behind Rawai Temple.

Among those arrested were two women, one of whom was pregnant.

All were taken to Chalong Police Station, where they were charged and held without bail.

Seized as evidence were four fighting cocks, two of which had already engaged in battle and appeared exhausted, badly scratched and partially de-feathered. Their legs were tightly bound together, rendering them unable to fight inside the rattan cage where they were held.

Other items seized were rattan cages, a small gas cylinder, six medical treatment kits, betting lists and several other items commonly associated with the bloodsport.

Although 42 people were arrested, they were only a fraction of those that took part. Many others who apparently managed to escape arrest stopped by Chalong Police Station to give moral support to their less-fortunate friends.

Chalong Police Duty Office Anukul Nuket said all of those arrested were to be sent to Phuket Provincial Court.

The four cocks would be fed and cared for at the station, Lt Anukul said. "Don't worry about their future. We need to keep them here because they are our evidence," he said.

In general, gambling is prohibited by law in the Kingdom. Cockfighting remains an exception, however, as it is permitted under the Gambling Act of 1935.

Helmet fines start July, 2011

PHUKET City Police have announced that the public awareness segment of their "100% motor-cycle helmet use" campaign will run another full year before offenders will face fines.

The campaign, which began in April, aims to bring helmet use in Phuket City Police District to 100%, for both drivers and passengers.

July 1 this year was initially set to be "D-Day" for police to start fining all offenders, but when the day came Phuket City Police Superintendent Wanchai Ekpornpit unveiled a surprising new tactic: rather than fine offenders, police confiscated their licenses and held them until the offender viewed a locally-produced movie showing graphic images of road accident

The results have been a marked increase in helmet use in Phuket

He estimated that about 70 people whose licenses are being held have yet to view it.

The number of viewers has been decreasing. A total of 396 people in total attended viewings on the first two days, but the figure had fallen to 66 viewers on

Col Wanchai told the Gazette that the reduction in the number of offenders was a positive sign, but he was concerned that helmet use still seems to decrease after dark.

"I'd like to tell them that we are continuing to check people at night, so please wear your helmets. It is for your own good," he said.

Chinese engineering firm eyes light rail project

REPRESENTATIVES of mainland Chinese construction conglomerate Ershisanye Construction Group met Phuket Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop on August 2 to discuss building a light-rail public transport system for

Founded in 1953, Ershisanye is part of the China Minmetals group, which enjoys annual revenues of just under US\$25 billion.

Last month, the parent group ranked 332 on the famed Fortune

Mr Soo was escorted by other representatives of the firm and Phuket MP Raywat Areerob.

"The traffic problem in Phuket needs to be solved. I have presented the issue to many overseas investors and this is one firm that has expressed interest in building a light railway on the island," Mr Raywat said.





Poisonous potions land Russian tour boss behind bars

A RUSSIAN tour operator has been arrested for allegedly selling bottles of liquor containing the pickled remains of poisonous animals including king cobras, centipedes and scorpions.

Perhaps unsurprisingly, the concoctions themselves turned out be poisonous.

Pattaya Police arrested 40-yearold Andrey Akulov on July 31 after receiving reports that one man died and others suffered strong allergic reactions from drinking his bizarre tinctures.

Mr Akulov allegedly claimed the concoctions boosted strength and sexual prowess. When police raided his offices in Pattaya they found 220 75cl bottles containing the potions, which the Russian had ordered from Laos.

Mr Akulov said he sold the bottles for 2,400 baht each to foreigners and Thais.

His "Intourist" tour company was a front for various other ille-



gal activities, police said. As well as the potions, police found several fake Nokia cellphones at his offices

During the search, a foreign tourist wandered in asking to change money. The police promptly added exchanging money without a license to the growing list of charges the Russian will face.

Later that same day, police searched another of Mr Akulov's offices, this time finding the equivalent of more than 600,000 baht in foreign currency and contraband.

Police say 'suicide' attempt was a fake

DESPITE an outpouring of public sympathy for a teenage girl who was talked out of an apparent suicide attempt by Satree Phuket School Students earlier this week, police have branded the incident a sham intended to deceive people into giving the girl money.

Police now say Orasa Lapruek, 19, who threatened to hurl herself from a pedestrian walkway into the path of heavy traffic on Thepkrsattri Rd in Phuket Town on Tuesday, is actually a serial con artist who has tried similar scams in other parts of the country.

Phuket City Police Superintendent Wanchai Ekpornpit told the media on Wednesday that police officers escorting Miss Orasa back to her hometown of Roi-Et gave in to her demand to be released by the time the vehicle reached Saraburi because her shouting had become so unbearable.

They filed a report, detailing the

incident, at Saraburi Muang District Police before they returned to Phuket, he said.

A police investigation revealed that the girl tried similar stunts in Pattaya in 2007 and Hua Hin August last year, when she threatened to leap from the fourth floor of an office building, Col Wanchai said.

She also once threatened to use a knife to kill herself outside a school in Petchaburi, he said, adding that her threatened suicide attempts were not real, but aimed at securing money from sympathetic people.

However, Col Wanchai said Miss Orasa had been treated and released from a psychiatric hospital at least once.

Social Development and Human Security officer Jitlada Sangprapan said her department will contact officials in Roi-Et to learn more about her background and get her the help she needs.

Senators in drive to revive Phuket Town

THE Senate Tourism Committee held a seminar focusing on revitalizing Phuket Town's Sino-Portuguese heritage at The Metropole Hotel on July 30.

At the seminar, Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwansupapana explained three major plans for the project. The first is to develop a historical trail as a "living museum" in Old Phuket Town with improved footpaths, signage, and to move cables underground.

The second plan is for structural improvement of buildings along the historical trail and its environs, along with the development of Klong Bang Yai as a recreational locale and the construction of a multi-purpose public facility in Queen Sirikit Park.

The proposed building on what is now a car park will provide a venue for some of Phuket Town's multiple festivals. There will also be a tourist information center to promote the area and educate tourists on its history, such as the history of Thalang Road as a bustling commercial street.

Also to be spruced up are the old Chartered Bank and police station, which will become Peranakan museums.

The third plan is to renovate buildings on Thalang Rd to showcase their Sino-Portuguese architecture in what will be a prototype for further development in Old Phuket Town.

Phuket Senator Thanyarat Atchariyachai said, "Phuket is now a world-class [tourist] destination with about 5 to 6 million visitors a year, but only 3% of them visit Phuket Town."

Mayor Somjai said, "This project study will support tourism activities in Phuket Town, and it will also contribute to cultural and economic revivals. "In the long term, it could also lead to the designation of the area as a World Heritage site, like Malaysia's Malacca and Georgetown," she added.

Little amnesty for 'red plate' drivers

PHUKET Land Transport Office (PLTO) Chief Kanok Siripanich-korn has told the *Gazette* that people driving cars with red license plates have one month to fit the regular "white plates" on their cars, or face the consequences.

The one-month reprieve in Phuket follows Land Transport Department Director-General Chairat Sanguansue's announcement last week of a crackdown on people driving cars with red plates, which can incur fines of up to 10,000 baht.

Mr Kanok said that many people in Phuket drive cars with red plates, indicating that the car has yet to be registered with the Land Transport Department.

He said he understood that some of these drivers were genuinely waiting for their car registration to be approved.

For such law-abiding citizens, the department will take no action against any motorist whose car is less than one month old or has not been driven more than 3,000 kilometers, whichever comes first.

More hours for vehicle registrations

THE PLTO has extended its office hours to make it easier for people to renew their vehicle registration.

Chief Kanok said the sections that process vehicle registration now start 30 minutes earlier, at 8am, have staff working right through the traditional business lunch hours, and finish one hour later, at 5:30pm.

Moreover, vehicle registration renewals are available every Saturday and Sunday at Big C from 10am to 6pm. The counter is on the basement level, turn right when off the escalator.

Many others, however, continue driving with red plates so that the plates suggest the car is brandnew or because they are simply waiting for their preferred "lucky number" registration to be approved, a process that can take several months, he added.

Red plates being used longer than they need to cost the depart-

ment revenue from registration fees not paid and make it much more difficult to track vehicles down in case they are stolen, he said.

The chief explained that red license plates are issued to car dealers and garages only, so that vehicles can be driven on public roads temporarily in order to arrive at dealerships or to be repaired.

It is illegal to drive cars with

red plates at night, from sunset to sunrise, without express permission from the Land Transport Department. Such permission will be restricted to a maximum of five consecutive nights, he added.

Driving a car with red plates at night without permission can incur a fine of between 200 and 2,000 baht, while driving a car with red plates during the day but for personal business can leave the driver open to charges of driving

an unregistered vehicle, he warned. "If we find a car with red plates that was bought one year ago, it means the driver has no intention of registering the car, and they will be fined between 1,000 and 10,000 baht," he said.

Motorists who have been issued regular white license plates, but have yet to fit them to their cars, face fines of between 200 and 2,000 baht, said the chief.

Chief Kanok also warned against using counterfeit red plates and not to decorate or modify genuine plates – red or white – by covering them with images or enlarging them. Doing so is punishable with six months to five years in jail or a fine between 1,000 and 10,000 baht, he said.

For those with pretty pictures on their bumpers, Chief Kanok warned, "Only license plates that have been sold by [Land Transport Department] auction are allowed to have images on them.

"If officers find modified plates, the officers will take photos as evidence, file the charge in our computer database, and the driver must pay the fine when they renew their car registration."





Phuket eyes 'huge' medical tourism boom

MEDICAL and healthcare providers on the island can expect to get a large slice of the 402.9 billion baht that the Ministry of Health (MoH) expects Thailand's medical tourism industry to rake in over the next five years.

Phuket Public Health Office Deputy Director Dr Wiwat Seetamanotch said, "Over the past five years, Phuket has enjoyed great success in health services provided to tourists and earned a huge amount of money as

Phuket is a world tourist destination that not only is beautiful in nature, but also complete in accommodations, food and transportation.

"In addition, health services here are cheaper than neighboring countries," he said.

The MoH, according to its current fiveyear plan for 2010 to 2014, expects to generate the 400-billion-baht windfall whilst spending only 3.13 million baht in developing the services that are to garner the revenues. According to MoH statistics, 550,161 foreign patients received treatment or healthcare in Thailand in 2001, but in 2007 that number had swelled to 1,373,807. Most were Japanese, followed by Americans and Europeans.

More than 70% of the foreign patients during that period were medical tourists, with 25% being expatriates and less than 5% being tourists who came to Thailand but not expressly for medical or health care.

The most popular health services during

that year were health checks, heart operations, knee replacements, cardiovascular surgery, plastic surgery, gender reassignment surgery, dental care and Lasik corrective eye surgery.

Dr Wiwat expects the number of medical tourists to Phuket to increase dramatically in the coming years.

"In the next 20 years, the number of elderly people in the world will rise from 18% to 20% – or one in five of the world's population. That is a huge market," he said.

Bus terminal set to open October 1

PHUKET's long-awaited second terminal for long-haul buses is now complete and will open for services October 1, Phuket Land Transport Office (PLTO) Chief Kanok Siripanichkorn has told the *Gazette*.

He explained that the delay in opening was in part due to managerial hiccups. "Bus terminals like this are usually handed over to local organizations to manage. Initially, Rassada Municipality accepted to operate the terminal, but later they said they had problems with obtaining the budget to do so.

"So we will run the new terminal until the municipality is ready to do it," he explained.

All buses exiting the new terminal will keep left, continue past the traffic lights and make a Uturn at Ban Vanit before heading north off the island.

The new terminal will serve all buses to other provinces except Phang Nga.

The old terminal on Phang Nga Rd in Phuket Town will continue to serve island buses to destinations such as Patong, Thalang and Rawai, as well as buses to Takuapa and elsewhere in Phang Nga.

elected community leader for Moo 5, told the *Gazette*, "The construction has created two main problems: First, as the one-way [southbound] road from Thep-krasattri Bridge onto the island to Tah Chat Chai checkpoint is now two ways, it's quite dangerous for local villagers when they go out to the main road.

"The point where the cars join the Thepkrasattri Bridge road is narrow, which is dangerous. Why don't they let cars to continue on the old roads, like they used to, and widen the road where it joins the bridge to make it safer?" he asked.

Mr Somporn also expressed concern about the impact the traffic diversion has had on local businesses.

The other major problem, he said, was that ditch drains on the main road have been blocked by mounds of dirt and other debris moved there during construction.

"This means that the water in the ditches on the main street of our village has nowhere to flow, so the road in our village floods all the time," he said.

"This problem still has not been

solved. It seems they only care about doing the construction work and don't care about us villagers. They don't notice how their work has left the community here living in chaos. I told them about the problem before at a meeting, but nothing has changed," Mr Somporn said.

Phuket Vice-Governor Teerayut Eimtrakul discussed this issue July 23 at a meeting with project leaders and Provincial Highways Director Arun Sa-nae. Mr Somporn said that meeting has amounted to nothing. "About 400 families – almost 3,000 people – are affected by these problems, but they are trying not to make a big issue of it, especially the Moken sea gypsies. But, I am the community leader and I have to do something for them.

"The problems are still not being resolved, so I plan to speak to the governor about it [this week]," he said.

Patthanapong Thongsuk, an engineer with the construction contractor Italian-Thai Develop-

ment Co, strongly disagrees with the suggestion of having traffic continue through Moo 5.

"Having the normal volume of traffic continue through the village as it used to, then joining the Thepkrasattri Bridge road and head north would be too dangerous," he told the *Gazette*.

As for the dirt-filled drains, Mr Patthanapong said he initially thought that the water in the ditches along the main street in the village flowed directly toward, and finally into, the sea – but not back along the main road.

To this he added, "We will dredge [the ditches] soon so the water flows through very well."


"People can tell us what problems they are facing because of the construction and we will listen and help them. They can call us at 081-8751840 and 086-6774664," he said.

As an example, Mr Patthanapong pointed out that his company was regrading the potholed dirt road from the beachfront up to the main road.

This work was not part of the construction contract and was carried out at no cost to the villagers, he added.



Govt shot journo: witnesses

WITNESSES have told police that a Japanese reporter shot dead on April 10 at the height of the red shirt protests was killed by government soldiers, Khao Sod reports.

Four people questioned by Chana Songkhram District Police said the bullet that killed Reuters cameraman Hiroyuki Muramoto came from the direction of advancing troops and that there were no "men in black" in sight.

The testimony is a setback for the government, which has sought to pin many of the 90 deaths during the 10-week anti-government protests on armed "terrorists" dressed in black.

One witnesses, a 54-year-old red-shirt protester, was among a group of red shirts advancing on soldiers who were trying to break up the protest at Kok Wua intersection around 7pm on April 10.

protesters and was standing right in front of the troops, he said.

Then there was an explosion that caused the soldiers to start firing into the protesters, the witness continued. Many red shirts were injured and Mr Muramoto, who was standing about one meter in front of them, was hit by a bullet.

The witness could not identify which individual fired the fatal shot.

A second witness, 55, said that the street lights in the area were cut before the soldiers started firing.

This witness was shot in the chest and had to be taken for hospital treatment.

A third witness, a 40-year-old army recruit who had joined the protesters, said he was among those fighting the soldiers at the time of the killing.

The soldiers had just started to retreat when there was a loud shooting sound from the back of the column. The witness was shot and later taken to the hospital.

The fourth witness was a 42year-old rescue foundation volunteer who was in the truck that carried Mr Muramoto to the hospital.

The cameraman was already Mr Muramoto got ahead of the unconscious when he was carried

Tour bus 'flies' off road, killing three

A TOUR bus overturned in heavy rain in Ubon Ratchatani province, killing three people and injuring 26 on August 1, Kom Chad Luek

The treacherous road conditions also caused two responding rescue vehicles to come off the road, adding to the injury toll.

The tour bus was heading from Bangkok to Chong Mek when the driver lost control on a steep hill near Ban Thai Thaworn village around 4.30am.

The vehicle flew off the side of the slippery road, flipping over three times before coming to rest. The roof, torn off in the accident, ended up crumpled around a roadside electricity pole.

One man was killed instantly. Another two died later in the

Heavy rain and the slippery road made the rescue very difficult. A rescue foundation pickup and a car both came off the side of the road on the way to the crash site.

Sawang Weerawong Police Superintendent Aphichart Sukkhalert said police have arrested the driver of the tour bus, who was lightly injured.

Police suspect the driver fell asleep at the wheel. He will be charged with negligent driving causing death and injuries, Col Aphichart said.

Finally getting some dam relief

WORK ON the much-needed 5.7-millioncubic-meter Klong Krata reservoir in the foothills behind Wat Luangpu Supha in Chalong can finally proceed, now that the Ministry of Natural Resources and the Environment (MNRE) has finally approved a request by the Phuket Provincial Irrigation Office (PPIO) to use a 60-rai plot of Forest Department land needed to begin construc-

The sticking point that held up approval for three years was never announced, but it certainly wasn't related to protests by treehugging locals or attempts by officialdom at environmental preservation. The basin itself is today mostly a treeless wasteland, its former natural beauty debauched by decades of tin-mining and rubber plantation.

The project will undoubtedly be a boon to the local environment, providing a reservoir with ring road and park that will greatly enhance the attractiveness of the area, which already boasts one of the island's most wellknown temples and a golf course.

Beyond question Phuket needs this project - and many others like it. Although blessed with a staggering average annual rainfall of almost 3,000 millimeters, the island has suffered chronic water shortage for decades.

During much of each year, water must be trucked over the hills to hotels on the west coast. Some hotels need more than 100 loads daily, the cost of which is crippling.

The slow-moving water tankers running

over the hills also cause traffic jams, accidents and even the odd fatality when their brakes fail while descending the steep grades.

All this adds to the hassle and expense of doing business or living in Phuket – hassles and expenses that, in these parlous economic times the island might surely do without.

In many parts of the island it is not uncommon for desperate residential dwellers whose pipes have gone dry to bathe in bottled water. Others leave spigots turned on, tubs beneath them, in anticipation of catching what they can when authorities turn on the water for a brief period. This leads to needless waste when no one is in the house to turn them off after the tubs fill.

In 2010, water supply shortages persisted well into May in some areas. Those of us in the newspaper business noted the irony of reporting floods and landslides at the same time as stories about water shortages.

The PPIO expects demand for water to grow by 27 million cubic meters annually over the next 17 years. Phuket needs to increase storage capacity as quickly as possible if there is any hope of meeting this demand, and there is simply no excuse for red tape to get in the

Burmese rights to human rights

AS HOTELS and luxury development projects continue to pop up around the island and sales agents contend for buyers, the thousands of men and women working sun up to sun down to make this possible are facing an ever-so-uncertain future.

It is no secret that a large percentage, if not an overwhelming majority, of manual labor in Phuket is done by Burmese migrant workers who for various reasons have made their way to the holiday island out of desperation - of a need to earn more money, however small the sum may be.

Speculation on numbers ranges from 50,000 to 500,000 Burmese laborers in Phuket, a large proportion of whom are undocumented and illegal.

In an ambitious push toward legalizing and protecting "all workers in Thailand", the government has set in motion a process that first requires verification of foreign workers' identity and nationality. This has unsurprisingly proved to be a major challenge.

Phuket has requested the verification of the nationality of

50,000 foreign workers and are awaiting response from the governments of Burma, Cambodia Laos.

If the names are verified, the individual will then begin their personal quest to obtain official identification from their home-

lands – no small task for someone earning less than US\$2 a day.

One obvious question comes to mind: What about the people whose identities are not verified? To this, it seems, Thai immigration has no official answer, yet.

People found to be working here illegally automatically qualify for deportation, and on the heels of the launch of the new verification process, Thai immigration has stepped up efforts to arrest illegal immigrants.

This has pushed the number of

An officer at Muang District Office replies:

The restaurant you are talking about is in a residential area and not in any of the entertainment zones, and is licensed to only sell food and beverage, including al-

If a venue is licensed as a "restaurant", it must close by midnight and cannot play loud music, especially not music so loud that it annoys people in the area. We have never given permission for this particular restaurant to operate as an entertainment venue.

Even so, if an establishment is in an entertainment zone and is licensed to sell food, beverage, alcohol and provide live music, it must close by 1am.

'Post-crisis' tourism recovering

DESPITE political and economic challenges, Phuket's tourism industry is proving to be resilient.

Tourist Association of Thailand (TAT) Phuket office director Bangornrat Chinaprayoon acknowledges this, saying that although 2010 tourist arrivals have fallen short of the expected 20% year-on-year increase, the recovery figures indicate that good news may be on the horizon.

This year's first quarter started with a bang, with a 30-40% jump in tourist arrivals over the same period last year.

March and April, however, saw arrivals slump as political turmoil gripped the capital and travel warnings spread worldwide. But the market is showing signs of bouncing back.

The Ministry of Tourism and Sports reported that international tourist arrivals between January

and June – which includes the period of the worst of the political turmoil – was up 13.7% nationwide over the same period last year.

Interestingly, while the Ministry's arrival numbers are up, reports from media outlets point out a drop in hotel occupancy over the first half of the year.

The Thai Hotel Association (THA) president Prakit Chinamornpong said, "Occupancy rates across the country should be at approximately 65 to 70%, but this year dropped to 40 to 50%," *TTR weekly* reports.

Although hotel occupancy figures may be bleak nationwide, Phuket is only experiencing a slight reduction in occupancy.

The South of Thailand Hotel Business Association director Suchart Hirankanokkul said Phuket had a 55.74% occupancy rate in July, down a mere 1.39% from last year.

This was a marked improvement on the previous month in Phuket, when occupancy stood at 45.5%.

Hirankanokkul is optimistic about the slow upward trend: "If there are no more problems this year, the [occupancy rate] recovery should continue".

Regionally, Phuket fared better than Phang Nga (12%) and Krabi (28%) in terms of occupancy.

This was expected, according to Hirankanokkul, who explained that Phuket usually holds up better than its neighboring provinces in the rainy season since it has more indoor activities to offer.

Chinaprayoon said representatives from the TAT would continue to support Phuket's recovery by travelling to Australia in September as part of a roadshow to promote Phuket. The show has already stopped in South Korea, Hong Kong and Indonesia this year.

Investors going for gold

ALONG with diamonds, gold is considered a truly precious item to possess. Its allure is universal and Phuket's Thai community is certainly a practitioner of the old adage "When in doubt, buy gold".

The ongoing financial crisis has made its appeal as a global investment choice even more appealing.

A decade ago, even so-called financial "experts" considered gold to be a poor asset choice. Gordon Brown, the dour Scottish puritan and ex British Prime Minister, infamously managed to sell half of the UK's 700 tons of gold reserves at an average price of US \$276 an ounce.

With prices currently sitting

solid at about US \$1,200 an ounce, it didn't prove to be one of Gordon's most astute investment decisions, to say the least.

Much has been written about the possibility that gold is now in a price "bubble", otherwise known as a price that is not supported by fundamentals and is sure to burst. However, the facts clearly don't support this fear.

Currently only 0.8% of all global financial assets are invested in gold, gold shares and Exchange

Traded Funds invested in gold.

In 1932 the allocation was 20%, and in the early 1980's it was 26%. Clearly, it's not overowned now.

If, for example, 2% of all global financial assets were to be invested in gold, it would equate to demand of approximately 85,000 tons – or the total global gold mining output for 34 years. It is clear which way the price would move in that scenario.

Additionally, it is now an established trend for sovereign wealth funds (Government Investment Funds) to buy gold assets as a means to diversify away from traditional holdings, such as US Treasuries, UK Gilts and currencies.

These days, all investment eyes inevitably turn towards China and in the case of gold, it is a distinctly bullish picture. China has more than doubled its gold reserves in recent years with current holdings of 1,054 tons. However, this still only accounts for 1.5% of China's total foreign exchange reserves.

The investment case for holding a portion of one's assets in

gold or gold-related investment funds is clear.

With the global financial crisis still far from over, the possibility of another severe downturn in equity markets is very real. In addition, gold is increasingly being viewed as a "currency" in itself – with the added advantage of not being controlled by governments.

Gold reserves are finite – more cannot be "created" overnight. The desire for governments and individuals alike to diversify the risk and hold a portion of their assets in gold is a sensible move that is unlikely to change in the near future.

What are the drawbacks? Well,

holding physical gold provides no yield and therefore a return can only be achieved if the price continues to rise. Also, in the unlikely scenario of the world getting smartly back on its investment and economic growth feet, the appeal of holding the shiny metal will diminish somewhat.

Therefore, unless an investor believes another global "financial meltdown" is definitely just around the corner, then an investment in gold-related assets should only constitute a portion of one's investment portfolio.

One of the best ways to gain exposure to gold assets is to invest in a diversified offshore investment fund. For example, the Blackrock Gold and General Fund invests in a diverse range of gold, silver and platinum mining companies.

This long-established fund has produced an average annual return of over 26% for the last ten years and has the highest performance ranking from the independent fund rating group Morningstar.

Gold may still be considered by many as jewelry rather than an investment. However, in these troubled times it should also be viewed as a "financial meltdown" insurance policy.

Diversifying the island's art trade

WHEN Eric Smulders, one of Phuket's leading art dealers, announced he was closing his Soul of Asia gallery in town, alarm bells went off in the island's commercial art sector.

With dealerships in town and in Surin, Mr Smulders has worked in Phuket's commercial art market for the past decade.

In the last five years he has gone from seven galleries to one, but he still sees growth potential in the island's commercial art market.

Mr Smulders said the art market is currently in a state of flux and dealers have to tailor their products to meet the consumers' needs. He hopes that a recently acquired collection of antique English silver artifacts and further concentration on the high-end market should complete his adjustment to the changed market conditions.

Mr Smulders will continue his art business, but will realign it with the changed market trends, concentrating on his Surin operation.

But with floods of cheap knockoff prints and antiques, investment in "luxury" items has dwindled due to the economic crisis, and caused damage to Phuket's commercial art sector.

In 2003 the island's art market had an annual turnover of about 800 million baht, but "Every year for the last few years, Phuket or Thailand has been dealt a blow that affects the economy...It started to change with the tsunami, but accelerated with the global financial crisis," according to Mr Smulders.

He explained that his stores, and the many others like them serve a niche market: "Most tourists can't, or won't, pay in the region of 300,000 baht for an antique piece of furniture imported from China, or a three million baht Salvador Dali sculpture," he said.

When he opened his business in 2000, Mr Smulders was one of three art and antiques dealers in Phuket.

Today the market is overwhelmed, and the reputation of art and antique dealers has diminished

Another reason for the declining interest in the high-end art scene is the availability of what Mr Smulders calls "The New-Old" fad piquing customer's interest.

Making cheap knock-off materials look aged by finishing processes has attracted many art lover's to these much cheaper pieces, rather than expensive originals.

This trend is damaging the art trade in Phuket, and Thailand.

But while sales in Phuket's art market are suffering, other dealers are diversifying their business portfolio to reel in new revenue.

Mausuni Mawing, who runs the Baan Sai-Nam gallery in Phuket Town, said, for him, business is on the up this year.

He reports a 70-80% rise in profits from January-July last year, but not in sales of his original pieces, but in profits made from his art classes.

"The problems in Bangkok have not affected my business this year as I'm devoting most of my time to creating art classes," he said.

Mr Mawing said that this year has been a good one due to a hike in interest in art classes.

Phuket on the big screen

IN THE midst of a boom in independent film in Thailand, Phuket is set to make its debut as an onscreen subject at a special Bangkok premiere on September 30.

The focus comes on the heels of a Thai film, Uncle Boonmee Who Can Recall His Past Lives, winning the top prize at this year's Cannes Film Festival, widely considered to be one of the world's most prestigious film festivals.

CHEF Angelo Magliaro is an expert in fusing flavors from around the world. Having spent 22 years working in kitchens throughout Italy, South and Central America, Austria, Germany and China, his latest job has him stirring his melting pot of culinary influences in Phuket, where local residents can only hope he stays for a while.

As the new head chef of Impiana Resort's Sala Bua restaurant in Patong, Chef Angelo is extending his worldly experience to include Thailand. He is currently in the process of creating a new menu for the restaurant, a portion of which is available now.

Dishes like Fresh Phuket Lobster Risotto, Pan-Fried Tiger Prawns, and Andaman Red Snapper combine the signature herbs and flavors of Thailand with other spices from around the world.

Chef Angelo says the key to his menu at Sala Bua is using just the right amount of Thai spice so that it complements, but doesn't overwhelm, the other flavors.

One of the new dishes at Sala Bua is Sea Bass en Papillote, which the chef has provided a simplified recipe for (right).

With a perfect balance of lemony-zest, fragrant wine and Mediterranean flavors, the recipe is a glowing example of the unique style he has brought to Phuket.

The creamy seafood dish combines the best of Phuket's ingredients with others from around the world: Phuket shrimp and squid, Japanese scallops, Greek olives, Italian wine and olive oil, and the quintessential Thai chili flakes.

Italian cuisine, however, remains the strongest influence in Chef Angelo's dishes.

Born and raised in Rome with four brothers, he was exposed to

the art of cooking at an early age. He quickly came to admire his mother's talent for preparing savory Italian meals for a family of

"My mother is an excellent cook, so as a kid I started to enjoy getting my 'hands dirty' while helping the big 'Mama'. Now the kitchen is where I feel I can express myself."

His cooking career began in Italy at the famous Grand Hotel Helio Cabala in Rome, where he found himself working under the guidance of four world-renowned Italian chefs, all with Michelin

Since then, his work has taken him all over the world, some of which was with the Food and Agricultural Organization of the United Nations, an experience he says helped develop his passion for food.

His most recent position was at the Sheraton in Shenzhen,

Add lemon zest and lemon juice and cook gently while slowly pouring in the whipping cream. Reduce everything to a sauce.


Take a hot dish and pour the Mediterranean sauce.

Paul James

PAUL James has been one of Patong Beach's most entrepreneurial and successful hospitality managers. He was a frequent visitor to Phuket during the 1980s when he worked in the Middle East.

In 1986, he opened the Expat Bar in Patong's Soi Bangla. It immediately met with success. The following year, with a group of investors, he broke ground to build the Expat Hotel which became a second home for a host of Australian and other expat workers on holiday from all over the world.

Paul has stayed at the helm of operations of the Expat Hotel for more than 20 years.

"We only have 47 rooms, all around our central swimming area, and they stay quite full with our returning guests from Sweden and Australia. Our sports bar has weekly pool competitions. For many years, the Expat Hotel was the home for Phuket's Hash House Harriers. In 1990, when I was the Grand Master, we bid to host an Interhash which brought 2,300 hashers to the island."

Paul was born outside London. He lost his father while still a young boy and took small jobs during the holidays as a house painter and paper boy to help with family expenses. After finishing school, he started working in a chartered

accountant's office. But he was still young and wanted more adventure.

He went to the Channel Islands and worked odd jobs, from picking strawberries to laboring in a rock quarry. His mother insisted he return to school to finish his qualifications for accountancy and he obliged. He picked up enough good marks in economics and politics to qualify for entrance to the London School of Economics. After a three year course of study, he held a Bachelor of Science in Economics.

Again, the young Paul was restless. He had worked in temporary accounting jobs during his studies and after graduation but gave it all up to travel and live in France where he worked for a furniture removal company and later as a temporary accountant in Paris.

He then headed to the Middle East for the big money, working first in Saudi Arabia as an accountant for an Aramco commercial diving contractor and then in Bahrain as an accountant for Brown & Root who fabricated offshore drilling platforms.


Paul spent much of the mid-1980s working in Iraq. He was the project accountant for the quantity surveyors for a major civil construction project in Baghdad. And during his holidays, he came to Thailand for relaxation.

"At one point, I left Bagdad and set up business with a Burmese partner in an import and distribution operation as I was hooked on living in Thailand. When that didn't work out, I returned to Baghdad with Thai language tapes and spent three years learning to speak, read and write Thai as I knew I would return to live on Phuket."

He met his Thai wife while he was building the Expat Hotel. They now have two sons. He applied for Thai residency 13 years ago and is now in the process of becoming a Thai citizen. He has passed the Thai language tests and has sung the National Anthem and the King's Song to an audience.


Paul was appointed the first consular correspondent in Phuket for the British Embassy in 1994, a position he held until he passed it on to Alan Cooke MBE in 2001.

Life & style Hua Hin tops for handicapped

WHILE a handful of resorts and tour operators are thinking outside the standard-sized box, Phuket remains largely inaccessible to physically challenged travelers.

Navigating urban areas in Phuket can be extremely challenging for wheelchair-bound tourists. Pavements are uneven and often obstructed by advertising boards.

Few buildings provide ramps or handrails, and many doorways are too narrow to allow wheelchairs to pass through.

Disabled visitors are limited to touring the island by taxi and while many taxi drivers are often helpful, they are not trained to assist disabled passengers.

Fortunately, there are some wheelchair-friendly destinations within easy reach of Phuket.

Thanks to an informative blog published by disabled residents, Hanneke and Jan van der Linde, the beach resort of Hua Hin is emerging as a shiny new pin on the disabled traveler's wall map.

Hua Hin is best known as a

royal retreat and popular weekend escape for wealthy Bangkokians.

However, international tourists are also well catered for, including those with physical disabilities.

Thanks to its royal heritage, Hua Hin remains unblemished by the rash of girly bars and jet skis commonly associated with tourism; one of the Kingdom's earliest resort areas it retains its quaint charm and is a blissfully peaceful retreat.

The grandeur of Old Siam echoes from the town's quaint streets and colonial mansions, including Thailand's oldest hotel which was originally built as a venue for royal parties thrown by H.M. the Queen.

Jan, who is wheelchair bound, and his wife Hanneke, enjoy life in Hua Hin, and recommend the town as a holiday destination for disabled travelers.

The couple have designed and built two holiday homes, fully adapted for wheelchair users.

Both include features such as electrically adjustable beds, roll-in showers and manual pool hoists.

The downtown location suits

travellers who enjoy easy access to markets and restaurants, while pool villa guests are only a quick roll from the beach, a massage and some bars.

Their travel blog, which can be read at www.wheelchairthailand. blogspot.com provides useful information for the disabled visitor, such as details of accessible temples, markets and bars for viewing live sports coverage.

Hanneke explains, "We believe Hua Hin is a good destination for wheelchair users and has an array of attractions, including the teak wood palace, the beach, temple grounds and shopping malls, are relatively easy to access, as well as many cultural shows, bars and restaurants."

Hanneke says Phuket's acces-

sibility needs a complete overhaul in order for it to become a destination physically challenged travellers can enjoy, starting with public transportation. After all, without transport, travel is impossible.

An accessible destination needs to offer more than a disabled toilet and parking space; every aspect of travel needs to be considered, said Hanneke.

Disabled wakeboarder: 'It's not easy on Phuket'

DISABLED French wakeboarder Bastien Perret, who is on a six month solo world wakeboarding tour, made a stopover on the island last week to enjoy one of Phuket's most popular disabledfriendly attractions: the Phuket Cable Ski.

After a horrific kitesurfing accident in 2005, Bastien, 32, was left disabled from the waist

His attitude remains positive however: "Life is not over because you are in a wheelchair, you can still have a good time and enjoy life. I want to show people that it's not impossible, you can do a lot of things and you can travel the world in a wheelchair".

"It's not easy in Phuket at all, and there are hardly any venues with wheelchair access," he said.





Top villa blunders

BUILDING a new home or villa from scratch on a tropical island is a brave decision. It can be an arduous and drawn-out process trying to find your ideal plot, most sought after designer or builder that fits the bill. Every detail must be scrutinized and that takes time; spades of it.

For some, this process turns out to be a nightmare.

Building from scratch is not necessarily a bad idea, but there are some common mistakes that first-time buyers make along the way. Let's take a moment to go over some of the great villa blunders that seem to occur time and time again.

Knowing the direction of east and west often eludes intelligent individuals. While sunsets and ocean views are all the rage, there is a common tendency for new home shoppers to forget both an early morning tropical sun or exposure to the afternoon's blazing sun can make living spaces

This doesn't mean a property built in the path of the midday sunlight isn't worth a look, it just means it's going to require some extra features to fix it. Extended overhanging roof lines, solar blinds and - if building has not begun reorienting the home can often solve this problem.

Consider that Phuket is becoming increasingly populated, has frequent seasonal droughts and lagging infrastructure, and it's easy to see that water is and will remain liquid gold for years to come. Those big infinity pools, posh landscape ponds, oversized bath tubs and lush landscaping all soak up this precious commodity, and could end up costing a lot more than originally anticipated.

Go to the Caribbean and in many places it's unheard of not to capture and store rain water. The use of guttering, substantial long-term storage, eliminating those fancy ponds (which in many cases end up leaking as soon as the villa is handed over) and using native plants that consume less water are all forward-thinking ideas.

Coming in high on the list of

exotic and wonderful during the planning phase, reality tends to come with a bite with the first electricity bill. Tales of monthly cost of 40,000, 60,000 or even 100,000 baht are not uncommon.

Who hasn't seen villas with a hundred blazing lights on in the middle of the night or the thundering of giant compressors needed to fill the arena-sized living spaces?

The real crunch comes once new home owners start renting out their unit and visitors don't have a care for conserving electricity when they're paying a few thousand dollars a day in rental fees.

Designs that don't account for common knowledge – such as the fact that heat rises - often overlook innovative ventilation or capturing the island breeze to cool down buildings. Insulation, designing custom air flow to fit the location and even the scoffed-at solar alternative, which is all-too often dismissed as "too hard" for Phuket, all need to be considered.

Make sure you plan for enough parking space for all your vehicles. Why so many builders never seem to contemplate the possibility that villa shoppers could own two vehicles remains a mystery.

When it comes to landscaping, remember the tropics. After the first rain of the season, many are surprised to discover a newly-formed rain forest in their villa. Yes, plants do grow exceptionally fast in this part of the world, so start off small in the beginning.

Also use caution with rooftop patios and stunning sunsails, which work so well next to Sydney Harbor or in Maui but here can turn you into something akin to cat on a hot tin roof.

Whatever decisions you may make, there remains one thing for sure: the local ATM is going to be your wingman and close acquaintance throughout the entire process. The devil indeed remains in the details and for the next decade or so, expect the island's handymen or home improvement companies to be a leading growth

compared with 35% under the previous rules, but with tougher new conditions.

Structures on hillsides with gradients up to 20% are limited to eight meters in height, while those on gradients of 20% to 50% are limited to six meters.

Also, buildings on gradients between 20% and 35% must leave at least 70% of the total property area as "open space".

Buildings on gradients more than 35%, must leave at least 75% of the total property area as "open space", with at least half of the open space as a "green area".

Buildings on slopes of 20% to 35% gradient cannot be larger than 90 square meters and the area of the land must be at least 100 square wah.

On gradients of 35% to 50%, buildings must not be larger than 80sqm in size and the land area must be at least 120 wah.

While the above rules apply generally, they may also be subject to other requirements, such as the "zone" the plot is in and how far it is from the high-tide mark.

Get some lookers in your bed

Gardening

SOME bedding flowers can be cultivated as annuals or perennials. It all depends on such imponderables as the climate, or the predilections of the gardener.

Take *begonias*, for example. They will not tolerate frost, so in temperate zones, they need to be brought indoors for the cold weather if you intend to keep them for more than one season. For this reason, *begonias* are deservedly popular in the United States and the UK, where they grace summer flower beds and hanging baskets, or spend winter indoors in pots.

The genus is huge, comprised of at least 1,500 species, most of which are tropical. In the wild, *begonias* are small, understorey plants, needing filtered shade and well-drained, but not dry, soil.

The most popular variety is *semperflorens*, which as its Latin name implies, flowers more-orless continuously, and which can be further subdivided into fibrous, wax and ever-blooming varieties. The flowers are small, but profusely produced, in shades of pink, red, cream or white, invariably with a bright yellow center or eye.

By way of contrast, the deeply veined leaves are predominantly dark green, with a triangular shape reminiscent of *caladiums*. Like *caladiums*, *begonias* are often grown primarily for their foliage, especially begonia rex, which hails from Assam, and *erythrophylla*, which has deep purple leaves. Propagation is by division or stem cuttings. A real *begonia* bonus: they are immune to most insect and fungal attacks.

More likely to catch the eye in Phuket is the *portulaca*. Unlike the begonia, which will need some cosseting, the *portulaca* or moss rose is drought resistant and prefers hot and dry conditions, with little in the way of water and nutrients. This is in part because its succulent stems and needleshaped leaves are primed for desert-like conditions.

Portulacas are even lower to the ground than begonias – no more than eight inches tall – so they can be used as ground cover. But the real joy is the dramatic, cup-shaped flowers which come in vibrant hues of red, magenta, orange, yellow and white, and which bloom whenever the sun is caressing them. Because of its immunity to drought, *portulaca* can be grown in crevices and on rockeries. It also grows readily from seed, though nurseries normally carry some in small pots.

Two other annuals/perennials worth thinking about are *rudbeckias* and *gazanias*. Both are daisy-like and belong to the *asteraceae* family, both enjoy full sun, both are mainly yellow in color and require little maintenance. *Rudbeckia fulgida* comes in several varieties, of which the best and longest lasting is the hybrid goldsturm, which has russet and mahogany tones.

Perhaps the best known *rudbeckia* is the one with yellow-gold petals and a black center, popularly known as "black-eyed Susan". While the hairy leaves are not a plus point, *rudbeckias* make good cut flowers.

Normally about one and a half feet tall, there is one variety, maxima, which rivals the sunflower for size, and is capable of producing five inch blooms on nine foot stems.

On the other hand, gazanias, or

treasure flowers, do not reach such heights. In common with begonias, they are usually six to twelve inches tall, though the flowers normally rise above the foliage. Gazanias, which come from South Africa and can stand plenty of direct sun, are in some ways better bedding plants than rudbeckias.

For a start, they come in a broader palette of colors – pink, white, and red as well as the traditional yellow and orange.

Moreover, the leaves are attractively notched and in some hybrids, notably ringens, are a pleasing silver-gray hue.

Given the right conditions, *gazanias* will quickly cover the ground with a dense mat of these leaves. But they may struggle in Phuket's monsoon season, for they dislike conditions that are both hot and humid.

Worth a try nonetheless, if you can find them. If plants are not available, packets of seed most certainly are.

Tip of the week

Struggling leelawadees

A READER recently wrote in to say that her leelawadees (plumerias or frangipanis) were under the weather.

She wrote: "As soon as the rainy season starts, the fresh green leaves turn to yellow-brown after which they drop. It looks like they are covered with an orange [deposit]."

The culprit is almost certainly rust, which now affects plumerias worldwide, typically leaving small yellowish pustules under the discolored leaves.

A possible cure is a spray with a copper-based fungicide, such as Bordeaux mixture. Prior feeding with a high-potash fertilizer (check the ratio of potassium on the packet) will help prevent the condition. Leelawadees dislike wet roots, so ensure that the soil is well-drained.

of the penalty area into the top left hand corner.

Satun United came back hard and had some excellent scoring opportunities, but these were foiled by some outstanding saves by FC Phuket keeper Jakkrit Thammasen.

FC Phuket took a 2-0 lead into the locker room with a well-taken goal by Ali, who shook off two defenders inside the penalty area before placing the ball calmly past Satun United keeper Sony.
