Census 2010 now online

FOREIGNERS can now take part in the national Census 2010 by completing the data forms online, accessed through the National Statistical Office (NSO) website (www.nso.go.th).

After several failed attempts, the Gazette contacted the NSO and on September 15 was informed by its ICT Center, "The system peaked while you were trying to access it. Sorry for any inconvenience.

"This morning our team has tested the system again to make sure that the system can be done completely. Please try to access again and let us know if you get problem."

The NSO has provided a tollfree Census information hotline at Tel: 1111 and ext 6, with Englishspeaking operators, they added.

Participants must register to complete the online forms, but can stop at any stage and return later to login and complete any incomplete fields.

As for the failed attempts, the ICT Center replied, "It would be best to use Internet Explorer instead of using Firefox.'

Bar owners fight for later closing times

BAR owners from across Phuket are joining forces with provincial officials in an effort to secure later closing times, and to set entertainment zones in Phuket Town.

Provincial Hall official Wigrom Jaktee told the *Gazette* that a task force will be set up comprising leading officers of relevant agencies and representatives from Phuket's nightlife industry. The move follows a series of meetings between the two parties that drew to a close on September 10.

Leading the charge for bar owners in Patong is Weerawit Kuresombut, of the "Entertainment Association in Patong". He is petitioning for bars in the entertainment zone in Patong to be able to stay open until 5am.

Representatives of bars and nightlife venues in Phuket Town are close behind, asking to be able to stay open until 3am.

This most recent proposal for later closing times was put forward at a September 8 meeting at the Phuket Merlin Hotel between entertainment industry representatives and a provincial committee

headed by Vice-Governor Niwit Aroonrat.

A primary topic of discussion was the way operating hours are determined both by the type of entertainment license held by the venue and whether or not it is in a designated "entertainment zone".

The committee heard from provincial officers that there are more outside the entertainment zone, but that in all of Phuket province, only 313 venues currently have entertainment licenses.

Phuket Town bar owners were told that to even establish the right to ask for later closer times an entertainment zone would first have to be established.

Entertainment zones were set than 500 bars in Patong that are out in Patong and Karon years ago,

but no areas of Phuket Town currently enjoy such privileges.

That didn't stop Phakamas Bootkaew of the Laguna Club in Rawai from asking for "less taxing" attention from the authorities. "We would like the officials who collect fees from bars to be from no more than 10 government organizations... It's costing us bar owners a lot of money," she said.

Attorney General moves for Aldhouse extrad

THE Office of the Attorney General (OAG) in Bangkok has petitioned UK authorities to place Lee Aldhouse under provisional ar-

Aldhouse, 28, is wanted for the stabbing Aldhouse is and what he is wanted for. murder of former US Marine Dashawn Longfellow in Rawai on August 14. The incident occurred after a brawl between the two earlier that night.

He was arrested at Heathrow Airport on arrival in the UK under an old warrant issued for his recall to prison.

Prosecutor Intranee Sumawong, OAG

Executive Director of International Affairs, told the *Gazette*, "To compile the application as quickly as possible, we asked for his prorest when he is released from Wormwood visional arrest as we have a treaty between Scrubs Prison in London on September 24. us, but we need to provide evidence of who

> She explained the application was made through diplomatic channels, via the Thai Ministry of Foreign Affairs. "The file is probably now at the Home Office. How long it takes depends on them," she said.

Ms Intranee pointed out that extraditing Aldhouse was a delicate matter. "The British will not extradite their citizens to any country for charges that include execution as punishment. So in the case of Lee, who is facing a charge of premeditated murder, we have to be specially careful.

"The Thai government probably will have to give assurance to the British government that he will not face execution, but that doesn't mean he will not be punished," she said, adding that the "assurance" is likely to have to be a pardon from execution to "something like life imprisonment".

Chalong Police Superintendent Wichit Intorrasorn, the leading officer in the murder investigation in Phuket, said, "This is the fastest extradition case in 10 years. American authorities and the victim's family are happy with our efforts. Right now it depends on England when he will be sent to us."

He added that Aldhouse's girlfriend, who has confessed to playing a key role in helping the fugitive escape Thailand, has agreed to testify against Aldhouse and to cooperate with the police in building their case - Atchaa Khamlo

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Karaoke girl murdered

POLICE on September 4 identified the body of the woman who was raped, murdered and abandoned in the hills just south of Patong. They told the Gazette the corpse was that of karaoke hostess Anicha Khaigunha, 21, from Khon Kaen.

Her body was found about three kilometers from Sirirat Rd, halfway between Patong and Karon, by waterworks contractor Ongard Kongkaew, 30, about 1pm the day before.

Mr Ong-ard was on his way to conduct checks on water supply pipes further into the hills.

Miss Anicha's head had suffered severe trauma and her body had been covered with large stones, with only her right hand remaining exposed.

Near her body officers found her underwear and a black bra, a used condom, a 20-centimeter long knife, a red T-shirt emblazoned with a skull and the word "Rockers", a mobile phone broken into several pieces, two pairs of black-and-white slippers and two candles: one used, one not.

Colonel Wichit Intorrasorn said the prime suspect in the murder investigation was one of the victim's boyfriends, whom he named only as "Maew".

He explained that officers took the clothes found near her body and showed them to as many bars in Patong as was necessary until someone recognized them as be-

longing to Miss Anicha.

He added that she worked at a karaoke bar on Soi Nanai for three months before her murder.

She left Khon Kaen when she was 16 years old, he added.

As Miss Anicha apparently had many boyfriends, Col Wichit said jealousy was the likely motive for the murder. – *Phuket Gazette*

Two-headed turtle dies

THE two-headed Hawksbill turtle born on the Similan Islands in July died in late August at about one month of age.

Chaloemsak Chaijit, information officer at the Royal Thai Navy base in Phang Nga, said the reptile died at about noon on August

Staff at the Sea Turtle Conservation Unit there noted the turtle's lack of appetite the day before, but were still surprised at the creature's rapid demise, he said.

Just two days earlier, the hatchling was not only healthy and gaining weight, but had also become the center's star attraction, drawing up to 50 visitors a day.

Unfortunately the death of the

baby turtle came before its gender could be established and thus be given a name, Mr Chaloemsak

Chadjane Chuaypetch, an officer at the conservation center, said staff there did their best to take care of the turtle, but that the nature of its abnormality was probably just too much for it to survive.

People still not aware of its passing continue to come to the center to see the turtle. They do not leave completely disappointed, however: its preserved remains are now on display in a glass jar, he said.

Business leader calls for action over illegal Burmese

THE Phuket Chamber of Commerce (PCC) is demanding that action be taken to deal with the the large and growing population of Burmese in Phuket.

Dr Sirichai Silapa-archa, PCC chairman and a deputy director at Vachira Phuket Hospital, told the Gazette that the number of newborns at Vachira alone ranges from about 60 to 100 a month.

The other two government hospitals, in Thalang and Patong, report about 15 to 20 new Burmese babies each month, he said.

"All together, that works out to about 100 a month, or 1,200 a year," he said.

A recent senate panel meeting held in Phuket was told the population of Burmese in Phuket could be as high as 200,000, a considerable chunk of the estimated 1.2 million in Thailand.

Although collectively referred to as Burmese by Thai authori-

ties, many if not most of the people in question are not ethnic Burmese, but rather people who hail from lands under the control of the Burmese junta. Many are ethnic Mon.

As the newborn babies of these people fail to qualify for Thai or Burmese citizenship, they represent a large and growing future generation of stateless people who have never known a home other

than Phuket. Such a situation could create social problems in the future, Dr Sirichai said.

The PCC has met with the Phuket Labor Office, the Employment Office and other agencies and groups to consult and try to formulate a policy.

The PCC is proposing four measures to the Labor Ministry to deal with the issue, Dr Sirichai said.

He outlined the measures as:

- A relevant agency must identify all workers under 15 years old. "We're also asking for cooperation from the organizations involved to not permit pregnant women to work, even if they hold work permits," he said.
- Workers must not be allowed to bring other people with them when they enter the country. Workers must operate strictly
- under the law.
- A renewed push to register all migrant workers.

There was no clear policy on what to do with Burmese children born here, particularly the issue of giving them Thai nationality, he said. - Phuket Gazette

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Sea gypsies refloat sunken oil carrier

successfully re-floated and towed ashore the *Choke Taworn 6*, which sunk in heavy seas off Phuket earlier this month.

The team, led by Surin Pramongkij, brought the vessel to the surface at 11am on September 14.

The boat was then towed by its sister vessel Choke Taworn 8 up Klong Tah Chin in Rassada.

However, it ran aground in shallow water before reaching its final destination, the Asian Phuket Marine Dockyard in Rassada.

The divers repositioned air-tight oil drums in and around the vessel to make it float higher in the water to complete the mission.

There were some signs of oil leakage around the wreck, but the estimated 25,000 liters of diesel in

A TEAM of sea gypsy divers have a holding tank inside the modified vessel's hull was still there. Choke Taworn 6 was en route to Koh Racha Yai with 40,000 liters of diesel when it sank about 12 nautical miles southwest of Phuket on September 4.

> The darkness at 43 meters and the sea gypsies' method of breathing compressed air pumped down through hoses from the surface drew criticism and concern from many who thought the mission too risky. Karon condo project stalls

CONSTRUCTION of a condo project in Kata has been temporarily suspended after local residents filed a complaint over the seven-story building blocking views of nearby Koh Pu (Crab island) located just offshore.

The residents, led by elected community leader for Karon Village 3 Boontham Jiamtua, had their complaint against Kata Royal Condominium heard at Provincial Hall on August 31 by a committee spearheaded by Provincial Palad Chaiwat Tephee.

Also on the committee were representatives from the government agencies involved, including Phuket Provincial Land Office, Phuket Office of Public Works and Town & Country Planning, Natural Resources and Environ-Phuket office, Damrongtham Center, Public Works Division of Karon Municipality, Muang District Office and Chalong police.

However, despite the locals' complaints about the project, the committee discovered after two weeks of testimonies and reviewing documents provided that the

condo development was fully compliant with the law and had all its appilcations approved before construction began.

Regardless, Mr Boontham called for construction to be capped at five floors, not seven, to preserve the view.

He based his argument on locals not being represented enough in the environmental impact assessment (EIA) survey conducted



and approved for the project in

In closing the committee hearing on September 15, Palad Chaiwat announced the committee will recommend to the governor to set up a panel to investigate further.

In the meantime, the ban on construction at the site continues.

Joe Kasisopha, one of the three partners in the project, told the Gazette, "It's not our fault. We have done everything right. If following the law is not good enough, then what is?"

He said 24 of the condo units had already been sold, most of them on the sixth and seventh floors. "We cannot stop at five floors. If we have to stop, it will cost us about 300 million baht," he said. - Pimwara Chokesakulpan

Construction of new incinerator underway

WORK to build Phuket's second incinerator at Saphan Hin is underway and the 940-million-baht facility should be completed by the end of the year, a provincial committee on trash management issues was told on September 8.

Prachoom Suriya, who heads the Phuket City Municipality Environmental Division, told the Phuket Provincial Trash Management Committee that project contractor PJT Technology is now surveying the site and beginning work.

PJT is to build and manage the plant for 15 years.

The new incinerator, to have two chambers each capable of burning 300 tons of trash daily, will be located next to the existing incinerator. The facility should be

ready by December this year, Mr Prachoom said in a TV report.

The new incinerator will have the capacity to generate 14MW of electricity, with approximately 10MW distribution for commercial purpose. Twenty percent of electricity generated will be used internally while the rest will be distributed to the grid for commercial purposes, says PJT's website.

Mr Prachoom told the committee that the project, being funded under the government's Thai Khem Kaeng (Strong Thailand) economic stimulus package, will include new paved roads to the incinerator and the existing landfill, floodlights, 12 CCTV cameras, new vehicles and on-site facilities to wash down garbage trucks.

Businesses put trash on agenda

THE recent publicity surrounding the environmental degradation of the beaches and water in the Andaman Sea, as well as the complaints about the environment and garbage in Ao Nang, have caught the attention of several local business leaders.

Despite repeated comments about the short-sightedness of the local government in tackling such problems such as wastewater discharge into the ocean, garbage collection and parking, little has changed over the years.

But now it is the private sector who see the real dangers of inaction. In discussion with Thai business leaders, many have com**ACROSS THE**

mented on the government structure of continual reassignment of top politicians who give little emphasis on solving long-term problems. It seems easier to pass these problems on to those who follow after them into office.

On the seventh day of each month, the Advisory Committee of the Governor of Krabi meets to make policy recommendations to the governor. This council comprises leading members of the

business community as well as government representatives from different ministry branches.

The meeting on September 7 was also followed by that of a sub-committee, The Krabi Education Council, chaired by former Krabi Town Mayor Chuan Phukaoluan.

Some of the issues at the top

of the agenda were the environment with emphasis on wastewater discharge into the ocean, and improvement in medical services for tourists, especially in light of the recent dengue outbreak.

The council believes that due to the ineffectiveness of the local government to tackle these and other issues, it is now the responsibility of the private sector to propose solutions though private and public ventures.

Their attempts to improve the quality of life in Krabi deserve praise, as does their efforts in helping the province to avoid making the mistakes that some of its neighbors have made through overdevelopment.

Dengue strikes: Two more deaths

AS DENGUE claimed two more lives in Krabi, the World Health Organisation (WHO) has strongly advised Thailand to step up its efforts to limit this year's rampant outbreak of the disease.

These recent deaths raised the number of deaths caused by the mosquito-borne disease to four in Krabi, and a total of seven in the south. While Phuket has suffered a massive outbreak this year, the disease has not caused any deaths on the island.

WHO Southeast Asia regional director Samlee Pianbangchang explained, "High-end treatment can save patients' lives from dengue but cannot tackle the outbreak itself as long as the public health intervention essential for controlling the vector is still weak."

Dengue has affected a large percentage of the country, with Krabi, Pattani, Songkhla, Narathiwat, Phatthalung, Satun, Chanthaburi, Phitsanulok and Tak among the hardest hit provinces.

Chok Chai School in Neua Klong District, in Krabi, recently sent students home early in order to spray for mosquitoes.

However, at the 28th Meeting of Ministers of Health and the 63rd session of the WHO Regional Committee for Southeast Asia last week, Mr Samlee pointed out that spraying chemicals alone will not eradicate the problem.

He stressed the importance of health authorities working with local communities to raise awareness of the seriousness of the disease and how to eliminate mosquito breeding areas from their homes.



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On guard to save lives

LEADING the Surf Lifesaving Carnival held in Patong on September 11 was Australian David Field, a driving force in raising the standards of lifesaving on Phuket beaches since 2001.

With over 20 years experience as a surf lifesaver and trainer, the New South Wales resident is currently in Phuket training over 80 lifeguards who patrol the 10 municipal beaches around the island.

Mr Field told the *Gazette* that the main challenge facing surf lifesaving in Phuket is that the general level of fitness and skill amongst local lifeguards needs to be raised.

"Every lifeguard must be able to prove their competency at any moment and when auditing individual beaches, the lifeguards are put through an evaluation assessing their fitness as well as their resuscitation and rescue skills," he said.

"There are different standards of lifeguarding on the island, based on what the older, more experienced lifeguards bring to their respective beaches," he said.

At Nai Harn, for example, the supervising lifeguard is very knowledgeable and is assisted by another lifeguard who has been trained to Australian professional standards, he said.

Although Mr Field thinks Phuket's southern beaches are generally well run, he believes Nai Harn is by far the best managed beach on the island.

"Surin is also very proactive in that people try to go into the water at the north or south ends near the rocks and the lifeguards are very quick to get there and speak to them.

"There are beaches where that

still doesn't happen and some of the lifeguards on a few of the beaches are a danger to themselves if they go in the water," he said.

Mr Field stressed that Karon is the most dangerous beach as it is open to monsoon winds and is not sheltered from large ocean swells that can rise quickly out of deep water and come straight in.

"Even after the swell has died down, there's a lot of movement under the water with both lateral and rip currents," he cautioned.

Another beach he feels could do with a closer look is Patong, which he says is an entirely different ballgame.

He noted that although Patong Beach has a gentle, sloping bottom and is sheltered from trade winds, the beach management plan "needs a strong hand".

"With previous contracts, the lifeguards were getting paid so little that they often ran other businesses on the side, which included hiring out jet skis and sun loungers," he said.

At the moment the Phuket Lifeguard Club has the contract, and has given all the lifeguards a pay raise and is promoting their status and training, but Field says a lot of the older guards are still running their businesses.

"If your job is to put your flags in the safest part of the beach, but you're also running a sun lounge business, where are you going to put your flags?" he asks.

"The lifeguards have told me anecdotally that if they put the flags in a certain position and the beach vendors don't like it, they will come and take the safe swimming flags and throw them on the ground.

"Patong needs a completely different beach management plan to the other beaches whose plans are all pretty straight-forward," he

Another problem he says are

flying wouldn't wash in Australia," he said.

You have to warn people.

"I can get fined 300 baht for not wearing a helmet while I'm riding a motorbike on Phuket. I support that bylaw because it's for my own protection, and it seems to be effective, but I feel it could also be implemented on the beaches, too.

"People are swimming anywhere on the beaches – red flag or not – and there are no consequences for them not listening to the lifeguards, except drowning," he says.

A portion of that issue comes down to communication barriers, but to fix the problem he suggests raising awareness. As soon as guests arrive on the island, there needs to be adequate signage at the airport and every hotel must have multilanguage pamphlets on surf safety for their guests.

"At the end of the day, if people still aren't listening to lifeguards and the warnings, then the lifeguards should be able to call upon the police for added support".

Activists' visa ban draws heavy fire

THE Thai government has come under strong criticism after it banned two France-based activists from launching a report in Bangkok on human rights abuses in Vietnam.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs asked the Foreign Correspondents Club of Thailand (FCCT) to cancel the press conference organized by the International Federation for Human Rights (FIDH) and the Vietnam Committee on Human Rights (VCHR), which was set to take place at the FCCT clubhouse on September 13.

The Ministry also denied visas to the event organizers, Vo Van Ai and Penelope Faulkner of the Paris-based VCHR.

Ms Faulkner told the Gazette that Mr Vo's visa had been cancelled on the eve of his departure for Bangkok following "pressure from the Vietnamese government about our press conference".

She was later denied boarding a flight from Paris to Bangkok with flight staff telling her they "had received orders from Thai immigration" to stop her from boarding as she was going to Thailand for "human rights reasons", she said.

AROUND THE nation

According to the FCCT website, the event would launch a report by the VCHR and the International Federation for Human Rights (FIDH) entitled "From Rhetoric to Reality: Human Rights in Vietnam, Under its Chairmanship of ASEAN in 2010".

The report aimed to "shed light on the human rights situation in Vietnam and the serious gaps that remain between Vietnam's professed adherence to international human rights law and its actual laws and practices to the contrary".

Ms Faulkner said, "I don't think Thailand fears anything from our report. We talk about the situation in Vietnam, in which human rights violations are extremely serious."

Mr Vo told the Gazette, "Hanoi's efforts to ban me from speaking are the most eloquent proof that the findings of our re-

port are correct. Now the [Vietnamese] government is exporting political repression, and seeking to stifle independent voices outside its borders".

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs on September 9 asked the FCCT to cancel the event as "it might contain information detrimental to a neighbouring country".

The FCCT asked the Ministry

to explain its position in writing. It received a response from Thani Thongphakdi, the Ministry's acting director general of the department of information, which stated:

"While the Royal Thai Government attaches great importance to the principles of freedom of expression and diversity of views, it also has a long-standing position

of not allowing organizations and/ or persons to use Thailand as a place to conduct activities detrimental to other countries.

"I therefore hope that the FCCT will respect this position and not allow its premises to be used for such activities."

Ms Faulkner, however, indicated the report is not intended to be "detrimental".

"In general, Vietnam sees civil society - inside and outside the country - as 'enemies', whereas our aim is to make constructive proposals to advance progress and reforms," she said.

The Ministry asked the FCCT to inform the event organizers they would be denied visas, a responsibility the FCCT declined to accept. The FCCT replied: "We feel it is unfortunate that the Thai government has chosen to apply pressure on us in this way. We would appreciate if the government reconsiders the wisdom of such pressure."

Ms Faulkner said, "I don't know why Thailand gave in to Vietnam's pressure. There must be political reasons within the ASEAN

Jitters as coup anniversary nears

SEVERAL bombs have gone off in Bangkok and other provinces as Thailand braces itself for the fourth anniversary of the coup that ousted former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra.

The disturbances have stoked fears that there will be fresh violence to coincide with the anniversary of the September 19

While the emergency decree banning large gatherings of people has been revoked in the northern capital, it remains in place in Bangkok.

Somyot Pruksakasemsuk,

leader of the June 24 anti-government group and editor of Red Power magazine, said his followers would hold an event to commemorate the September 19 coup at Rajprasong intersection and in Chiang Mai.

Sombat Boon-ngam-anong's Red Sunday Group will mark the day with events at Democracy monument and Rajprasong intersection.

"Don't worry, it will not be a red shirt demonstration but a commemoration of an undemocratic incident," he said. "It is an open activity in a civil society."

On September 17, red shirt leader Jatuporn Prompan, who is also an MP for the Pheu Thai Party, will lead fellow red shirts in laying roses in front of Bangkok Remand Prison where some of their leaders are being detained.


The Metropolitan Police Bureau will deploy 400 anti-riot police to keep security at Rajprasong.

The bureau expects 2,000 to 3,000 red shirts to join the protests, during which demonstrators will tie red ribbons and release red balloons at the intersection.

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Thai top cop visits troubled **Deep South**

ROYAL Thai Police Commissioner-General Wichien Potephosree headed to the Deep South last week to calm fears after two teachers were murdered by insurgents.

All 365 schools in Narathiwat Province closed for six days following the killings of Wilas Kongkham, 54, and his wife Komkam Petchprom, 53.

The pair were gunned down in a drive-by shooting on September 7.

Arrest warrants have been issued for seven people in connection with the murders, Gen Wichien said.

Amid demands for security upgrades, Confederation of Teachers in the Southern Border Provinces chairman Boonsom Thongsriprai told one reporter, "Our teachers are still the victims and there is no guarantee that it won't happen again."

Muslim prayer hall is part of Phuket life

NEWS that Rawai Municipality is considering building a *surau* (Muslim prayer facility) at Laem Phromthep has ruffled some feathers among *Gazette* readers, though at this stage it is difficult to understand why.

Few details have been made available about the project because it is just in the conceptual stages. However, that fact hasn't stopped readers from expressing concern that a large prayer hall or even a mosque may be built at the site. In fact a *surau* can be just a small room; they are commonplace throughout Southern Thailand and many of those voicing concern have probably passed by them many times without even noting their presence.

Such concerns surely can't be over the general location, as there are already four mosques in the area. These were all well-established before the local population began to swell with migrants from other parts of Thailand and abroad. It is also a fact that at least a third of Phuket's native population practices Islam and that a large percentage of visiting tourists do as well.

One reader called for a *Gazette* poll to gauge public opinion on whether the proposed structure would contribute to over-development of the area. But if the facility is to be built anywhere near the huge car park, rows of illegally-built souvenir stalls or the new 3.8-million-baht restroom facility, it strikes the *Gazette* as a little late to begin that discussion. One reader referred to the proposed struc-

all Phuket Cable customers to verify the status of bill collectors.

They can do this by asking to see their employee ID cards, which state their full name and position.

The card is also stamped with the company logo. Customers can also call to the company office to ask whether the person is a real employee or not.

As for the broadband service, the service is currently only available at the Land and House Park Phuket residential estate on Chao Fa East Road in Chalong.

Many consumers have expressed interest in this service, which we plan to extend islandwide by the end of next year.

PRESENTLY, a huge number of tourists come to Phuket and new transportation infrastructure is needed to support that number.

On average throughout a year about 160 flights a day land at Phuket Airport, bringing a total of about six million tourists, and this is likely to increase - but Thepkrasattri Rd is not being upgraded to accommodate the needs of the growing number of tourists.

Put simply, the road will not be able to support the number of tourists arriving in Phuket when the airport will be expanded to accommodate up to 12 million tourists.

Now imagine what it will be like when the Phuket International Convention and Exhibition Center (ICEC) opens and even more activities take place.

No matter which part of the island tourists go to, they have to pass through Thalang. If we don't develop or create a new transportation system now, it will affect us in the very near future.

The light-rail project is the perfect alternative, especially as Phuket doesn't have standard public bus services like they have in Bangkok, and it will reduce the number of cars on the road.

Its stations should start at the airport and stop at each important location along the way to Chalong. For example, in Thalang, people could catch the light rail at Baan Kian intersection and get off at Central near town.

They could park their cars at the station or take a motorcycle taxi from their home to the station for only 10 or 20 baht. This

RECENT reports revealing that incidences of violent crime are alarmingly high in Phuket have got me worried. I moved away from the grime of inner-city life in London to get away from all that. I chose Phuket because I thought there was no better place to do so than an island paradise in the land of smiles.

Not only are the stories of violent crime reported in the Phuket Gazette raising my awareness, but also the frequent stories heard from friends about being robbed while driving motorbikes or waking up to a stranger in their house, rummaging through their belongings.

With murderers, rapists and robbers afoot, I have found myself locking doors and viewing people with suspicion, a tendency I had worked hard to bury.

Although the majority of these crimes may involve Thais, an extremely high proportion seems to be carried out by Westerners. This is particularly alarming considering our demographic on this island is much smaller.

Much of the violent crime committed by farangs may be down to drunken tourists in Patong, but there are more cases emerging that involve expats.

For example, the widely reported crimes of Ron Fanelli, a long-time Phuket resident who murdered a woman and stuffed her remains into a suitcase, and Lee Aldhouse, a Muay Thai tourist who allegedly murdered a man after an argument.

Is this island a safe haven for the psychopaths and hooligans of the West?

ATM jam scam?

I AM having trouble with Kaisakorn Bank and Bank of Ayudyha at the moment. I hold a Kaisakorn bank account, and I tried to withdraw money from an Ayudyha Bank ATM. The machine jammed, didn't dispense any cash and went "out of order".

I reported it immediately and photographed the machine. My account has been debited for the withdrawal.

I keep calling Kasikorn and emailing them, but they just tell me that Ayudya Bank say the money was dispensed.

I asked them to review the video recording taken by the machine, which will show I did not get any money, but they said it was out of order and there is no video.

This seems like an outrageous scam, how can I prove the machine didn't give the cash if they will not release the video.

I have a photo of the machine taken one minute after the time of the withdrawal (date and time stamped photo) clearly showing it is "Out of Order", which proves it could not have just dispensed the cash to me.

It seems pretty clear they know the machine was faulty, but will not admit it. I have called Ayudyha Bank, but they refused to discuss it as I do not hold an account with

Is there an independent body in Thailand I can appeal to? Or do you have a suggestion as to what to do? It was 20,000 baht and I would like to get it back, plus this

procedure for dealing with customers is very open to abuse by the banks and should be reviewed. Matthew Lempriere

Nungruthai Kenchaiwong, of Ayudhya Bank Customer Service Department, replies:

Patong

You must notify the branch where you opened your account. After that, the branch will have the relevant department coordinate with Ayudhya Bank about you not receiving money from the Ayudha Bank ATM.

Then Ayudhya Bank will have the relevant department check their ATM machine. The system can check back to the day that the incident occurred. If there is a discrepancy, then under Ayudhya Bank policy we will transfer the money back to your account in about seven working days after the discrepancy has been con-

To do this, we need to know the location of the ATM, the date and time of the incident and the total amount involved.

Chinda Chuthong, Bank Officer at the Kasikorn Bank branch on Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi **Road in Patong, replies:**

Our general policy is that the customer should contact the bank where the account was opened. The customer must bring bankbook, ATM card, passport or ID, and the ATM number, which is on the machine and on any transaction slips from the machine.

After we have received the report from customer, we will coordinate with the other bank involved to verify the customer's report, as we are unable to check any transactions made through other banks.

This process will take about seven working days.

SET shines in 2010

Island Investor

THE STOCK Exchange of Thailand (SET) has been one of the world's best performing markets this year. As this newspaper went to print, the index had risen 26%, making Thailand one of the top 10 markets worldwide.

Considering the violent demonstrations that crippled much of central Bangkok during April and May, the SET has performed remarkably well.

The strong performance came about after the protesters were abruptly dispersed by the Thai army on May 19. A total of 91 protesters died during the protests.

The SET's high performance over past four months has been due to foreign investors buying into a market that considerably underperformed during the previous six months

Other Asian markets performed strongly during this period and as such the SET had a lot of catching up to do after the demonstrations ended.

Despite the negative worldwide impact on Thailand's reputation, and the impact on tourist arrivals, the Thai economy has continued to power ahead this year following the global rout of late 2008 and early last year.

Ignoring pessimistic forecasts at the height of the protests, Thailand's second quarter GDP grew by 9.1% from a year earlier and is expected to surge ahead in the third quarter as foreign and domestic investors alike become more sanguine over the political situation.

Also, the Thai Government is expected to raise the forecast for the full year to around 7%. This will be

the strongest growth since 2003.

Most observers agree that despite political problems Thailand should continue to do well for the remainder of this year and into next. Growth will continue to be driven by foreign investment into Asia and Thailand together with intra-Asian trade.

Although Thailand has certainly not decoupled from the chronic problems in the West, it should still post good growth next year.

Another indication of the renewed optimism pervading the SET is the average daily market turnover.

After sinking to very low levels during April and May the SET has seen turnover approaching US\$ two billion per day in recent weeks. On certain days this has exceeded Singapore's market turnover which is a far bigger exchange.

On September 6, the SET's turnover was 63 billion baht (US\$ two billion) which was the fourth highest turnover ever seen on the exchange. It is safe to say that foreign and domestic investors are back in force.

Domestic retail investors have traditionally been the largest

participants in the SET.

Historically they used to account for around 75% of all turnover but this has eased in recent years as domestic mutual funds have increased their size and activity.

With such a sizable retail participation the SET used to be, and probably quite rightly, compared to a casino. However, that tag has faded somewhat with the increased involvement of foreign and local institutional investors.

Expat investors can easily open an account to invest in the SET. Thai brokerage companies can be found from the SET's website: www. set.or.th. There are a number of Thai brokerages who have offices in Phuket.

Most of them now offer online trading services which reduce the commission rates charged. Some also provide English language research about Thai stocks as well as research on the political and economic situation. Many also provide access to historical price charts.

However, expats considering investing have to be aware that this is a high risk investment as prices can move dramatically very quickly.

It is not recommended for most investors and should only be considered as a small percentage of one's overall investment portfolio.

To avoid some of the risk associated with directly investing into companies listed on the SET investors should consider an offshore fund which specializes in Thai stocks.

These funds are professionally managed and spread their investments into numerous individual shares thus reducing the overall risk.

Some of these funds have long established performance records and can be purchased through an offshore structure thus avoiding tax implications for expats in Phuket.

Fertility clinic to inject life into tourism

A NEW 20-million baht fertility clinic set to open next month will be the largest and most comprehensive of its kind in the south of Thailand.

Safe Fertility Center will officially open at Phuket International Hospital (PIH) on October 1.

The center will provide In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) services from new specialized treatment laboratories for embryology, andrology, cryopreservation, and genetics.

IVF has been used to overcome both male and female infertility problems as well as help couples who would like to ensure their children are born free from hereditary diseases.

The new IVF service at PIH can even help couples determine the sex of their unborn child.

Center Director Dr Wiwat Quangkananurug and Director of Embryology Tida Ruttanajit have worked together for the past decade, helping infertile patients at the Safe Fertility Center in Bangkok.

When the Phuket center opens next month, they expect many foreigners will come to the island to receive the fertility treatment.

"Previously at PIH, we could only give initial consultations, conduct primary investigations and sometimes deliver Intra Uterine Insemination (IUI)," said gynecologist Dr Manop Janthanaphan.

"But with the partnership between the hospital and Safe, we are heading in a new direction with higher standards of IUI, Intra Cytoplasmic Sperm Injection (ICSI) and Pre-implantation Genetic Diagnosis (PGD) processes," he said.

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TAT eyes domestic, repeat market

THE TOURISM Authority of Thailand (TAT) has come up with a five-point strategy to promote long term sustainable growth in the tourism sector.

The strategy will be the blueprint for the TAT's policies in 2011.

The strategy aims to promote monetary and emotional value in Thailand's tourism sectors.

In the past, Thailand has gained a reputation as a quality, yet affordable tourist destination.

The strategy will emphasize the country's value-for-money and at the same time strengthen the country's brand image as a place of unique charm, friendliness and hospitality.

The TAT will also promote domestic tourism to decrease the dependence of the country's tourist destinations on foreign visitors. At the same time it will also work to increase the country's share in the global tourism market by targeting repeat visitors, a group which accounts for 62% of total tourist arrivals, whilst also marketing the destination to potential first time visitors.

The TAT will also plan out short term market recovery initiatives to mitigate unforeseen shocks that may disrupt the flow of foreign visitors to the kingdom. Depending on circumstances, the TAT may opt to use quick win strategies and special offers to boost short term recovery from tourism crises.

The TAT has also signed a MoU

with businesses and stakeholders in the tourism industry to promote community based sustainable

When asked how this strategy will benefit Phuket's tourism development, a confidential source expressed less enthusiasm in the TAT's five-point balanced strategy, saying that the TAT's one-for-all policy is not going to help achieve

maximum benefits for Phuket. In the past the TAT has put too much emphasis on quantity and less on quality tourists.

According to the source, TAT's growth estimates of tourist figures give out the wrong market signals to hotels, encouraging them to build more rooms every year.

This leads to unrelenting competition and price dumping in the hotel industry. Unfortunately tourism growth in Phuket has been promoted without any consideration given to the limited capacity of public infrastructures.

The amount of garbage for example, has long outstripped the ability of Phuket's incinerator to cope and as Phuket's tourism industry grows, garbage problems will continue to exacerbate.

To achieve sustainable tourism growth in Phuket, the island needs policies tailored to solve its unique problems.

A hotelier interviewed suggested that zoning is one of the ways that can promote sustainable tourism in Phuket. According to the hotelier, zoning can help to limit and regulate the number of hotels that can be constructed in a particular area.

It can also help to protect the island's forests and natural

The source said TAT should promote "creative tourism" in Phuket to foster the island's cultural identity, like the Baba-Peranakan wedding event held in Phuket Town in August.

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Life & style Evil gets a 3D afterlife What else is on...

Resident Evil: Afterlife

Director: Paul W.S. Anderson Starring: Milla Jovovich, Ali Larter, Kim Coates, Wentworth Miller Genre: Sci-Fi/Action/Horror **Gazette Rating:** 2/5

SINCE 2002, audiences have been subject to a resurrection of the Resident Evil franchise once every three years. The video game-turnedmovie series, which has solidified Milla Jovovich's status as the ultimate dreamgirl for video game nerds throughout the world, makes its fourth appearance in Afterlife. Don't be fooled by the title, though, because there is very little that is heavenly about this movie.

The names of the sequels -Apocalypse, Extinction, and After*life* – all give the impression that the Resident Evil story is progressing through a thickening plot of life and death. Yet all the films seem to be bizarrely similar: lots of zombies chasing a small group of survivors with big guns in desolate cities, with a side order of bloodied dogs.

The zombies in Afterlife aren't interested in eating the dogs though, so you're fairly confident it's not set in Korea or China.

Indeed, the film starts off in Japan. But there's not much new going on. Alice (Jovovich) kicks off the film by killing the evil scientists in an underground facility, then finds she is alone again, scanning the western US for signs of life.

The plots seem to be growing ever-thinner. At some point, a

franchise needs to accept that it's only going to be interesting if it drives its story forward.

For Resident Evil, that seems to be presenting a problem. Granted, no video game adaption was ever a paradigm for art-house film making, but where Resident Evil once combined an interesting premise with a hearty dose of zombieslaughter action, the scales have tipped almost entirely in the favor of the zombies.

What's left is mindless action that banks on the idea of audiences drooling at masses of the undead, big guns, pretty people and licenses to kill. There might be a bit of irony in that...Unfortunately, the film has

virtually no sense of humor, and unless a zombie movie is truly terrifying, it needs comic relief.

Lucky for us, she does run into another human being: another finefigured woman wearing tight clothes who is also endowed with ass-kicking skills. What are the chances?

At this point, the target audience for Resident Evil should be pretty transparent. Teenage gamers - AKA 17-year-old boys who hang out in their rooms and grow increasingly afraid of girls – should feel privileged to have an excuse to put the controller down and take a trip outside.

They probably won't be

disappointed. Zombies do growl and fall in droves, and that should be enough to satisfy the fan base that has kept the franchise alive for almost a decade.

At the end of Afterlife, though, none of the characters are really any different than in the first minute, and nothing about their circumstances has changed all that drastically. You can argue that I just dropped a huge spoiler – but I say that only applies to the first and second time a franchise essentially repeats itself. Three or more, and I think I'm doing you a favor.

There is, however, one aspect that makes this latest installment stand out from the rest: It's the first live action movie based on a video game to be presented in 3D.




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
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Gianni Ferrara

GIANNI Ferrara is the chef and engaging proprietor of La Gaetana Italian restaurant in Phuket Town. The landmark eatery will celebrate its tenth anniversary this year. It is one of the few successful international restaurants in Phuket Town.

"We only have eight tables but I have a passion, a commitment to deliver quality and happiness to our guests," says Gianni.

And happiness is how to describe what Gianni and his charming wife, Khun Ake, deliver with the menu of daily flavors posted on the wall. Gianni heads up the cooking operations and does almost all of the shopping directly from the source.

He was born near Salerno, close to Italy's famed Amalfi coast. He was enterprising as a young child, working three hours every afternoon in the neighborhood pasty shop from the time he was nine years old. By the time he left school in 1980, he was ready to study hotel management.

He found he was drawn to the kitchen where he learned the healthy cuisine of the Campagna region, with its emphasis on fresh seafood and less butter and sauce.

"I worked and trained at the same hotel every summer and was popular with the guests. They helped me to get winter jobs at

some of Switzerland's top ski destinations, such as the Seiler Hotel in Zermatt and in Gstaad.

"I learned German and how to satisfy the expectations of the five star guests.'

He developed particular skills behind the bar with exotic cocktails and joined a European cocktail competition in Paris at the Holiday Inn, where he received an award for his efforts.

In 1987, Gianni decided to seek adventure abroad. He was accepted to work for Club Med after passing his bartending examination in Rome. It was the beginning of a 15-year career with the international hospitality icon. He was posted at many glamorous locations as he became a trainer in the Club's food and beverage departments.

In addition to such postings as Greece, Tahiti, Spain, Mexico and Indonesia, he came to Phuket in 1992 to manage the beverage outlets. After a year, he was sent to work in St Moritz and on New Caledonia, but he had met his future wife and partner Khun Ake at


the Club Med in Phuket and they vowed to return to the island and create their own business.

In 2006, to accommodate his many friends who smoke, he opened the back of the restaurant to create an area where smokers could feel comfortable.

Gianni works almost every day, but when he takes time for leisure he provides consulting services to other restaurants and hotels. And he pursues his interests in photography, gardening and collecting Italian and Thai stamps.

Sniffing out the dog w

DOG trainer Russell D Russell's new Thailand Canine Academy here in Phuket is the place to take your pooch to learn some manners, or just to meet the man known as the "Dog Whisperer".

Russell, or DJ Sniffer, as he's sometimes known has been around dogs his whole life and is a graduate in canine psychology and behavior.

He recently graduated from the prestigious Triple Crown Academy in Austin, Texas in the United States.

The Academy is the largest training, behavior and event center for dogs in the world with an exclusive client list that includes former First Lady Laura Bush's dog, Dax.

Russell took intense training, comprising both practical obedience and focused training skills, as well as sessions on canine learning theory and canine aggression.

Working with many dogs and behaviors, as well as some of the world's top canine trainers and handlers, Russell believes there is much he can offer Phuket.

Russell wants to bring some focused obedience and home manners training to Phuket pets.

"People often say, 'well my dog knows sit and stay', but 99% of the time they don't. If your dog

chases a cat towards a busy road will he sit when you ask him to?"

Russell says people often want a dog, but when it turns out to be a terror, they can't understand why and want to re-home it, or worse, dump it.

"It's untrainable they say, but this is not true, it's simply a case of miscommunication and misunderstanding."

Russell uses his two highly trained dogs, Sassy and Kay to help him show Phuket dog owners how their pets should behave.

"Showing people what trained dogs can do is more effective than just telling owners what is possible," he says.

One of the most important lessons Russell teaches is the place command, or boundary stay, which means the dog should stay in a given place until they are told they are free to move.

"It really makes a difference if you can show people what this means to a dog. People don't believe it's possible with their own dog, and then when they see it, it's like magic!"

When it comes to obedience training, Russell says treating dogs and their owners individually is the key to his success, making training "work for them".

Russell says in recent years a number of television shows highlighting canine behavioral problems has brought acceptance and understanding to the forefront of pet training.

"Before people may have thought they just bought a 'bad' dog, now they realize it's just a behavioral issue and help is available," he says.

Russell says attitudes toward dogs in Thailand compared to the US and Europe varies immensely.

Fouling in public, not keeping dogs on a lead and mistreating dogs can lead to heavy fines in the US and Europe.

In Thailand the rules are more lax with dogs running free, but they are often mistreated.

Russell said dogs should not be allowed to just do their own thing.

"You walking the dog yourself is miles better than opening the itself, "he says.

Russell also wants to see more dogs being used for search and rescue, and therapy purposes in Thailand.

"Therapy Dogs are essentially used to brighten people's days and are often taken to orphanages,

gate and letting the dog walk retirement homes or even to hospitals to help recovery," he says.

> Both Russell's dogs are certified and registered with Therapy Dogs International and have already worked with the British International School on a canine reading program trial which was hugely successful.

"Developing a service dog program here in Thailand would be fantastic. Whether it's for assisting in children's education, providing narcotic detection dogs or search and rescue dogs - the humble canine can provide an immense amount of help to the people of Thailand," Russell says.

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

The majority of Cefalù's pasta is homemade, of course, and most ingredients are imported.

This experience has taught him what is necessary for a restaurant to succeed.


His emphasis is on food, service and atmosphere.

As many of the models live on Phuket, they were given rapturous applause by family members and friends in the crowd as they put on an impressive modeling performance.



Promthep toilets almost ready for new business

Having taken about four months to complete, the new toilets were built on the site of the previous toilet block, near the souvenir stalls.

An officer at Rawai Municipality's Engineering Division told the Gazette, "We're not sure when they will open. The municipality has to have a meeting first."

PROPERTY Tackling power line zette problems in town

PHUKET City Municipality, working with the Provincial Electric Authority and public and private telecommunication companies, recently began stripping down unused power lines and other overhead cables along Mae Luan Rd in Phuket Town.

Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwansupapana told the Gazette the pilot project is part of a municipal plan to beautify Old Phuket Town and surrounding areas.

Power lines and cables have been installed underground along Thalang Rd and Soi Romanee in the Old Phuket Town area in the first part of a three-phase project.

The next step is to do something about the proliferation of cables along roads in surrounding areas.

The work must be carried out in stages as the entire project would require a huge budget that the municipality is currently "not ready to propose", she said.

To bypass some of the budget constraints, the government agencies involved have coordinated

their own budget requirements so that each can play their part in the carrying out the work, she said.

Telecommunication companies including TOT, CAT, TT&T are all taking part in the project.

The work that began on September 11 involves removing unused power lines and regrouping power cables that are still being used along the full 1.4-kilometer length of Mae Luan Rd.

Mae Luan Rd was chosen as the starting point of the project as it is a main artery along which city dwellers travel to reach many of Phuket's west coast attractions, explained Mayor

After work along Mae Luan Rd is complete, the project will focus on Thepkrasattri Rd, Phuket Rd, Yaowarat Rd and Wichit Songkram Rd, she said.



IF YOU'RE feeling dirty, hot and bothered, then a visit to the new "shower testing room" in the Häfele Design Center may be just the thing to liven up your day.

It's a place where you can test the latest in shower technology, but it's also handy for cooling down or just taking your daily wash.

Don't worry about bringing your own soap and towel as the self-service testing room provides them free of charge.

There are even locks on the doors so other shoppers won't get a peek of you in your birthday suit.

With five different showers available, there are endless combinations of pressure, temperatures and water colors – yes, colors – to try out.

Showroom manager Varnchai Rungruang explains why it is important that the customers can test store products, no matter how odd it might seem.

"They need to know what they are buying, and be satisfied with the product. Particularly if they are considering expensive things,"

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Plant a seed and watch it grow

Gardening

JUST over a year ago, part of this column was about cultivating your own flowers. With the rainy season in full flow again, it's time to go into a bit more detail.

The easiest way to grow plants for your garden is to use seeds. Packets can be obtained from large supermarkets such as Tesco as well as a few garden centers and from specialist retail outlets.

One of these shops is on the old airport road going north from Phuket Town, a few hundred yards before SuperCheap. Well worth a visit.

In Phuket, the range of packeted vegetable seeds is good but the range of flowers is less so. Take care to observe the instructions on the packet.

Of course, you can always use your own seeds. The easiest seeds to get are from annuals such as zinnias, gomprenas, African marigolds or cosmos daisies.

Indeed, these will readily selfsow if left to their own devices. Before homosapiens upset the apple-cart, seeds were solely distributed by nature's agencies: wind, water or via the innards of birds and animals. Then man came along with his own ideas.

After plants have finished

flowering, seeds or fruits form. Seed heads should be collected only when they are dry, and the individual seeds are beginning to fall away.

Generally a rule of thumb, applies: The larger the seed, the bigger the

end product will be in your garden. They vary in size from the microscopic seeds of orchids, through to the pea or bean-sized fruits of the legume family, to the substantial stones of thevetianas and avocados. These big stones should only be taken from very

However you come by your seeds, remember that once sown, they should be cosseted. Opinions

> vary as to which is the best sowing medium, but it should be relatively low in nutrients, and porous enough to allow the delicate initial rootlets to develop.

At first, seedlings will feed off the

food in the seed itself. So straight top soil is likely to be too strong, and also prone to pests.

Sterile compost mixed with coconut fiber and river sand is probably Ok for most small seeds. Succulents must have sand: cacti will not survive without silicates

Choose clean plastic pots or trays. Dirty ones are liable to harbor disease. Pots are best since they do not dry out so quickly.

Seedlings too, will not survive bone-dry conditions for long. Plant just below the surface for small seeds, about one to two centimeters for bigger seeds.

Larger seeds [such as those of canna lilies] will germinate more rapidly if they are soaked in water for a couple of days, or if the tough skin is scratched or scarified. The potting mix should be moist but not saturated.

If possible, apply water from below. This will avoid the twin possibilities of washing the tiny seedlings out of the soil, or drowning them with over-liberal use of the watering can. Place your seeds in a place where there is plenty of light, but little or no direct sunlight or rain – at least initially.

Water sparingly, look out for predators such as ants and check for wilt or "damping off".

finally plant them. Never hold them by their tender

seedlings with care when you

stem, instead hold them carefully by a leaf when you place them in position. Losing a leaf is not a disaster; crushing the stem is.

Don't expect perfect results either – many will not germinate, and if you sow your own seeds, they may produce genetically regressive offspring.

Shrubs and trees are less often propagated by seeds. The most common and easiest method is to use hardwood stem cuttings from a healthy parent plant.

Not all shrubs will respond to this method, but a few basics do apply. Cut your slip just below a leaf or node at a sharp angle. Cuttings are normally ten to twenty centimeters long, but will need to be bigger for large, thick-stemmed shrubs such as *plumeria*, or for trees.

Remove the lower leaves and bury the bare stem three or four centimeters deep in a mix of soil and sand to increase permeability.

You can even start it off in water with a mild dose of fertilizer. To speed up the rooting process, dip the base of the cutting in rooting hormone before planting.

If you prefer to put the cutting directly into the garden, remember to keep it moist. Using a pot - is preferred. Place it in partial shade and wait for the shoots to appear.

From firsthand experience, the most rewarding plants to propagate from cuttings are large shrubs with woody stems.

Examples of these include allamanda, thevetiana, oleander, pereskia (wax rose), euphorbia millii (crown of thorns), thunbergia, milkweed, orange jasmine, hamelia (firebush), gardenia, bougainvillea and tecoma

WHEN it comes to success stans (yellow trumpet).

In general, these work best if you take hardwood cuttings. Foliage plants such as croton, aglaonema and dracaena can also be struck from stem slips.

If there is going to be a delay before you immerse your newly acquired cuttings in soil, temporarily steep the cut ends in water. Not euphorbias

The cut end needs to be dry, and may even benefit from a day or two of exposure to the air.

















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
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



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FC Phuket crowned champs

GOALS either side of halftime from Thawin Butrsombat and Nithirot Sukuma were enough to ease FC Phuket to a 2-1 home win over Phang Nga FC at Surakul Stadium on September 8.

Thawin, signed during the midseason break, put the Southern Sea Kirin 1-0 up after just seven minutes when he kept his composure in the box to finish off a sweeping five-man move that began deep in the FC Phuket half.

Nithirot slotted home a second in the 57th minute when Diarra Ali's shot rebounded off the goalkeeper after the African star had sprung the Phang Nga offside trap to run onto a clever through ball from defender Ronnachai Jinaket.

With 15 minutes remaining, the visiting side pulled a goal back but FC Phuket held on for the win to complete a memorable league campaign which has seen them collect 55 points.

The presence of the Regional League Division Two South tro-

Coach Arjan Songsamssub made a number of changes to the side that beat Phatthalung at the weekend, with Nene Bi dropping to the bench and Diarra Ali and Camara Hamed returning to the starting line up.

Buoyed by the crowd, the Southern Sea Kirin started the match brightly, forcing two corners in the opening five minutes before Thawin gave them a deserved lead.

With the early goal, the large crowd inside Surakul expected a walkover but the home side took their foot off the gas and the game became increasingly sloppy.

Phang Nga almost snatched an equalizer out of the blue, hitting the crossbar with a header from a dangerous free kick from the left.

FC Phuket continued to push forward looking for a second goal before half time but Diarra and Thawin were both guilty of wasteful shooting and the home side had to settle for just the one goal lead at the break.

Into the second half, the visitors made the brighter start and had a great chance to equalize at 50 minutes, only to put the ball over the bar.

They were made to pay just six minutes later as Nithirot made it 2-0 after great play between Ronnachai and Diarra.

With a two-goal cushion, FC Phuket became complacent and sloppy play allowed Phang Nga back into the match after 75 minutes, scoring with a glancing header from a dangerous cross from the Phang Nga right.

The goal pushed Phang Nga forward in search of what had seemed an unlikely point.

Despite a couple of anxious moments, the home side closed out the match and after the final whistle collected the league trophy in front of their delighted supporters.

FC Phuket now turn their attention and motivation to the playoffs, where they will be in the running for the right to play in Division One next year.

Next generation of Phuket's footy stars make Euro splash

TWO Phuket boys from the Youth other EU countries. There are a Football Home have just returned from two weeks at professional football clubs in Germany.

Nonthawit Onting and Phonlawat Nonta, both 13, are two of the most outstanding players of their age group in Thailand. Both are hoping to one day become professional footballers in Europe.
