# Festival reels in millions

TOURISTS coming to Phuket for the annual Vegetarian Festival from October 8-16 are expected to pump at least 200 million baht into the local economy during the nineday festival.

Occupancy rates in Phuket Town stood at 50%-60% on Tuesday, but many hotels in the island's capital district were already fully booked for the last three days of the event, said Wanaphapar Suksombul, Assistant Director at the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Phuket Office.

TAT-registered hotels and accommodations in beach areas are already enjoying occupancy rates of about 70%, she added.

Ms Wanaphapar said the TAT expected a 10% rise in the number of visitors this year because the event coincides with school

vacations in Thailand and the three-day China National Day holiday on Monday that marks the start of a long holiday period in China.

Adding to the influx are two more direct flight services to Phuket, both landing on the island for the first time on October 12.

Qatar Airlines inaugural Doha-Kuala Lumpur-Phuket will arrive at 10:25pm, the first of the airline's six-daily-flights-a-week service.

Earlier that day, Air Asia's inaugural direct flight from Ubon Ratchathani will land at 2:20pm.

Ms Wanaphapar added that the bulk of the visitors coming were ethnic Chinese from Singapore, Malaysia, Mainland China, Hong Kong and Thailand. Other important inbound markets during the period are Australia, India and the Middle East, she said.

"Phuket will be more crowded than ever." she said.

# Call to keep Veg Fest traditional

PHUKET Shrines Association President Prasert Fakthongphol has asked participating shrines in this year's Vegetarian Festival to have their mah song (spirit mediums) use only "traditional" objects to pierce their cheeks.

The request reflects the increasing popularity of "modern"

objects like beach umbrellas, power drills and motorbike parts in recent years.

Among the traditional items he suggested as the instruments of choice are those mentioned in Chinese legends. Such objects run the gamut from swords, axes, and maces to 12-inch spiked-staffs

with figurines of Chinese gods as headpieces.

Maintaining this tradition was difficult because some mah song do not register with the shrines.

"They pierce their bodies outside the temples and join the processions on the streets," he

# Police to launch helmet crackdown island-wide

POLICE across Phuket are preparing to take expanding this campaign to come into force the helmet crackdown campaign beyond Phuket City Police District to cover the entire island, effective January 1.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Maj Gen Pekad Tantipong told the *Gazette* the move to enforce the traffic law islandwide follows the success of the campaign launched in Phuket Town.

"Since [the campaign was launched on] July 1, people in Phuket Town have been more aware of the importance of wearing helmets.

"Now we rarely see motorcycle riders and passengers without helmets, so I am across all of Phuket."

He assigned the superintendent at each police station on the island to set a team up to promote the campaign and inform residents of the impending crackdown in their respective jurisdictions.

The teams will also ask private and government organizations in their areas to support the campaign by donating helmets.

From January 1, the punishment for passengers found riding without a helmet will be the same as for those in town: Firsttime offenders must watch the mandatory road-safety and traffic law film.

From July 1 next year, repeat offenders organizations introduce separate punish-– at least those in Phuket City Police District – will be fined.

In Patong, posters featuring Kathu Police Superintendent Arayapan Pukbuakao and Kathu Traffic Division Inspector Jakkawat Boontawegunsawat, both wearing helmets while sitting on a motorcycle, have been posted throughout the town.

"We are drafting an MoU [memorandum of understanding] for private and government agencies and community leaders to sign to acknowledge and support the crackdown next year," Col Arayapan said.

# Westin defers taxi decision

MANAGEMENT at the Westin Siray Bay Resort and Spa, a local affiliate with global resort giant Starwood Hotels, has deferred announcing its decision on whether to allow a local taxi counter inside its new luxury resort on Koh Sireh in Phuket.

The announcement followed a meeting on October 1 between resort management and members of the local taxi co-operative, Sirae Island Taxi Service.

While the meeting was under way, about 50 members of the taxi co-op massed at their taxi stand in the front of the resort, waiting for good news.

Inside the resort were the resort's management team, three representatives of the taxi co-op, a representative of the Hello Phuket company and Phuket City Police Superintendent Wanchai Ekpornpit as witness.

Praderm Klomsuwan, chosen by the co-op to run the taxi stand,

said this was the co-op's third attempt in two months to set up a counter on resort grounds, just as local tour operator Hello Phuket had already done.

The co-op has 70 drivers offering non-metered fares in vans, sedans and tuk-tuks, but only a small number of guests walk out of the resort in search of transport, said Mr Praderm.

"Some of our drivers get only one fare in three days," he said.

However, he added that the number of other taxis seen entering the resort to pick up passengers indicated that many more of the resort's guests wanted to use taxis, but did not use local drivers simply because they did not know about them.

"We wear uniforms. We are polite to guests. We keep records of each trip made in order to be able to track down any lost items. We are never rude...

"We just want the hotel to share their income with local villagers," Mr Praderm said.

The resort has a list of set fares, which start at 300 baht for a taxi ride into central Phuket Town, a ride of about 5 kilometers.

The cost to hire a van to either Phuket Airport or the Big Buddha image in Karon is 1,000 baht.

# Policeman wanted over Kata bar spat

CHALONG Police are looking to question a fellow police officer over his alleged role in the demolition of a bar in Kata.

Boonlert Thamsue, owner of what was the So Nice bar near Club Med, told police on October 6 that his Maj Wichan Suwannasit arrived around 8am with four other men and pulled down his bar.

Chalong police said Maj Wichan, originally from Nakhon Sri Thammarat, has been trying to evict Mr Boonlert since he bought the plot for two million baht in May.

But Mr Boonlert claims he has rented the plot for about seven years. Before So Nice Bar, which he opened two years ago, he ran a taxi center at the site.

Maj Wichan filed a complaint to evict Mr Boonlert in April. The case is now at court.

Now Mr Boonlert wants to press charges against Maj Wichan, who once was stationed in Chalong, for destroying his prop-

Chalong police believe Maj Wichan is still in Phuket and have issued a summons to question him.

# **500** more cars on the road each month

MORE than 500 new vehicles are being registered each month, compared with 50-100 per month last year, says Phuket Land Transport Office Director Siripanichkorn.

Around 10% of new registrations are by foreigners and 40% are by Thais from other provinces, he said.

While 2009 saw 23,760 new registrations in Phuket, this year looks to speed past that number, with 21,112 new registrations already made from January to August this year.

So far this year 4,905 cars, 1,261 pickup trucks and 14,833 motorbikes and other vehicles such as vans, tractors and road construction equipment, have been registered.

Registrations last year numbered 4,773 cars, 1,450 pickup trucks, and 17,371 motorbikes and other vehicles.

The number of vehicles registered in other provinces but being taxed in Phuket, from January to August this year, were 27,819. Last year's total was 39,232.

In the same period this year, 26,515 Phuket-registered vehicles were taxed in other provinces; last year there were 37,153.



# New artificial reef approved

THE artificial reef project to regenerate coral growth in Karon Bay has been given the final nod of approval as it passed its second public hearing September 29 without objection.

The dropping of concrete "artificial coral cubes" to the sea floor is set to begin mid-2011.

The hearing was held at the Department of Marine and Costal Resources (DMCR) and chaired by Karon Municipality deputy mayor Sompong Darbpetch.

The 10-million-baht budget for the project was approved in August and will see between 1,600 and 1,800 concrete cubes dropped about 3,000 meters from the shoreline, DMCR officer Prajuab Mokharat said.

This project – similar to, but larger than the one in Mai Khao last March – aims to protect and recover marine ecology, marking the area where sea fishing is illegal. It will also serve to increase the number of dive spots in Karon Bay.

At the hearing, residents had no

objection to the project, but said they would like to see more plans detailing the exact location of the new reef.

They want to participate in choosing the design and location to effectively prevent fishermen from trawling in the bay, they said.

The DMCR has offered to set up a team of their officers, with Karon Municipality representatives, dive tour operators and local residents, to decide the best location for the new reef.

The team is expected to begin work this month.

# Governor Tri sets to work

NEW Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha began his first week in office by meeting honorary consuls from 11 nations, assuring them that tourism development was his top priority.

Gov Tri, who has a master's degree from the University of Kentucky in the US, conducted the meeting in English.

The honorary consuls asked to continue the schedule of quarterly meetings between all the honorary consuls and the governor.

The meetings, initiated by former Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop, were a valuable way of exchanging information about problems facing Phuket's expatriate community and working together to find solutions, they said.

Gov Tri acknowledged the request and told the honorary consuls not to worry, because as tourism development is his top priority, assuring the safety of visitors was one of his primary objectives.

He will also work hard to protect tourists from being taken advantage of during their stays here, he said.

Czech Republic Honorary Consul Anurak Tansiriroj after the meeting said there were many



Gov Tri with some of the consuls. long-term problems Gov Tri needed to address.

These included taxi prices and public transport issues in general, crime and slow processing of passengers arriving and departing at Phuket International Airport.

"The high season for tourism is coming soon. One of the first problems that needs to be fixed is the services at Phuket Airport.

"There should be more x-ray machines and [luggage] conveyor belts at the airport to better serve the large number of tourists. Some people who arrive at the airport well ahead of time still almost miss their departing flights after wasting so much time standing in line," he said.

These and other issues will be raised again at the next consuls' meeting scheduled for November 22, he said.

# Free WiFi in Phuket Town

PHUKET City Municipality is now providing free WiFi internet at Saphan Hin and similar free access at Queen Sirikit Park on Thalang Rd, Phuket Town, is currently under testing.

TOT has signed a contract to provide the 24-hour service at both locales for three years, with the municipality paying 180,000 baht a year for the privilege.

Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwansupapana said the project targets an initial 600 users a month, with each user expected to stay online for about two hours at a time.

"We expect Phuket to become a 'learning society'," she said.



TOT began testing the service on October 1. Saphan Hin is already operational while the service at Queen Sirikit Park is expected to be up and running soon.

Pamphlets explaining and promoting the service will be available from Phuket City Municipality from October 7, with details of how to log on and the operational range of the networks.

The free service in Phuket Town follows TOT launching a similar project with Wichit Municipality in March to provide free WiFi at Sriphuwanart Park.





# All that Jazz

SIX people escaped with their lives after a woman drove her new Honda Jazz into the pond at Saphan Hin after a night on the town.

Chamaiporn Rongwang, 23, told police she and her friends were returning to their home in Wichit. She opted to take Soi Saphan Hin as a shortcut. Dangerous enough in the day, the narrow, winding road proved too difficult for Ms Chamaiporn to navigate in the darkness.

She drove the car straight into the pond near the Sipa Building, where the annual Loy Kratong festivities are held.

All six were trapped inside the car by the central locking. Luckily, a window was down and all six scrambled to safety after they opened the door from the outside.

# Hapless thieves return to scene

BUNGLING thieves abandoned a stolen pickup and their own car after being unable to find the way out of a housing estate in Chonburi October 2.

They were soon arrested – after returning to the scene and asking police officers if they could have their car back.

Sombat Maithong, 45, reported the theft of his Toyota Vigo pickup to Sriracha Police around 3am.

Mr Sombat said he had spent the night at a leaving party for a colleague at the Sriracha District Electricity Office.

He thought nothing of the thieves as they followed him into the Ladda Village estate in a Mitsubishi Lancer, assuming they were residents.

As he was opening his gate, one of the thieves jumped out of the car, got into the pickup and sped off. Mr Sombat shouted for help and called the police.

Before long, Sriracha Police inspector Jirarot Rotphanuphat had found the pickup and the car abandoned in the estate.

In the trunk of the Lancer, police found wire cutters, pieces of metal suitable for picking car locks and various other items.

Shortly afterwards Miss Pacharee Deeram, 18, and Ekaphong Khongruay, 24, pulled up on a motorbike.

Mr Ekaphong told the officers that he was the owner of the car and would like it back. The pair were promptly arrested.

The thieves told police they drove round and round the estate looking for the way out. When the police arrived, they jumped out of the vehicles and fled on foot.

The Mitsubishi Lancer proved too dear to leave behind, however, and the hapless Miss Pacharee and Mr Ekaphong returned hoping to retrieve it. - Khao Sod

# Spat over 'Sarasin Bridge 2' roadworks resolved:

# Coconut grove gets to stay

ITALIAN Thai Development Co (ITD), the contractor hired to build the new bridge off Phuket, is having a rough time completing the project.

In August, the villagers' complained that earthworks at the site had blocked the village drains, causing the village to flood.

ITD engineers inspected the drains, only to find they were blocked because they had not been cleared in a long time – not because of the construction earthworks.

Mai Khao Tambon Administration Organization has since cleared the drains and now the village floods no more.

Back in August the villagers also complained of northbound traffic being diverted from the Tah Chat Chai checkpoint directly to Thepkrasattri Bridge and off the island.

So ITD diverted the traffic back to the old route past the beachfront restaurants that many of the villagers rely on for their livelihood.

Then the one project ITD has offered to do free for the villagers hit a snag: the owner of the one house left standing in the way of a free road expansion past the local temple refused to move.

Lantom Saelim, 61, told the Gazette she and her husband Gao Saelim, 75, had been living in the house since 1991. They moved there after the land they were living on was used to build Thepkrasattri Bridge 20 years ago.

"I am willing to move, but my cousin doesn't want to give the land to the project. So I am staying here for him."

She explained that her cousin has been farming coconut trees on the land, which was handed down to her by her father, since the Sarasin Bridge was built in 1967.

"As my house is not on land being used in the official project [ITD offered to build the road for villagers for free], I have not been offered any compensation for relocation," she added.

However, following a meeting involving no less than the provincial offices of the Highways Dept, Treasury Department and the Crown Land Office, the road will now go ahead, but via a 250-meter detour around the house.

ITD engineer Dr Patthanapong Thongsuk said, "We have yet to determine how much the road will cost as the plans have yet to be drawn up, but it will be more expensive... When we can start building the road depends on how fast [Thalang District Office] approves them."

# Police net fish poachers

TWO men from the Rawai sea gypsy community were charged this week for collecting protected fish species off the Phuket coast.

Marine Police deputy inspector Lt Natthapong Preugtharathikul and officials from the Phuket Marine and Coastal Resources Conservation Center (CRCC) arrested Wijit Meesin, 35, and his father-in-law Boontiam Bangjaak, 58, off Koh Racha Yai with 18 specimens of protected species aboard their boat.

Mr Boontiam confessed to the charges, saying the fish were bound for Chatuchak Market in Bangkok. The two men said they took orders from a Phuket-based middle man.

Paitoon Panchaipum of the CRCC said a rise demand from Bangkok has prompted a surge in poaching of protected species in local waters in recent months.

Waters around Koh Lone, Koh Koh Aeow, Koh Racha Noi and Racha Yai are popular poaching grounds, he said.

It is difficult to catch poachers, he said, as they now leave the fish in buckets and throw them overboard if they see marine police approaching, he said.













# Krabi needs more flights: tourism chief

THE Chairman of the Krabi Tourism Association, Ittirit Kinglake, recently told the TTR Weekly that Krabi needs more airlines to support the hotel industry. He pointed out that room capacity is running ahead of airline seat supply, and that there are not enough flights to Krabi for tourists during the high season.

Currently, almost 20% of Krabi's inbound flights are connecting direct through Singapore or Kuala Lumpur as the flights from Bangkok are often full. Thai Air and Thai AirAsia both have three daily flights from Bangkok, but these are not sufficient to fill

Mr Ittiirt pointed out that with 18,000 rooms in Krabi in the three-

to five-star category and only about 1,600 airline seats a day coming into Krabi, more flights need to be added.

This year, four European charter companies will fly direct to Krabi: Thomas Cook, Nov Air, TUI Fly and FinnAir.

With the upgrading of the new terminal to be used exclusively for international arrivals, capacity at Krabi Airport will increase by

provide more demand would be the best route to fill the hotel rooms in Krabi.

In the meantime, the tourists are enjoying a wide selection of hotels all cutting their prices to gain market share.


Three live auctions were held as well, and the response was a raucous round of bidding that raised even more money.

# 'Star' saga gets messy

A DRUG overdose, threats of lawsuits and the intervention of a Cabinet minister have all been thrown into the mix as the "Film and Annie" baby scandal grows.

Actress Rungnapa "Annie" Brooke claims superstar Rattapoom "Film" Tohkongsub is the father of her three-month-old child.

Mr Rattapoom's record lable RS initially cancelled all his contracts.

But in a surprise turnaround, RS chief executive Surachai "Hia Hor" Chetchotisak came to the defense of his beleaguered superstar at a press conference October 28, accusing Ms Rungnapa of dating four men at the time of her affair with Mr Rattapoom.

After falling pregnant, she told all four they were the father and demanded 250,000 baht from each man. Mr Surachai claimed.

Ms Rungnapa is threatening to sue Mr Surachai for slander.

It has also emerged that the Minister of Social Development and Human Security has called both superstars in a bid to mediate in the dispute.

It has been revealed that Mr Rattapoom overdosed on antianxiety pills and spent October 6 in intensive care at BNH hospital.

Friends of Mr Rattapoom believe the overdose was an accident, rather than a suicide attempt.

# Newin exposes hit squad

ELEVEN men arrested in Chiang Mai last week were allegedly plotting to overthrow the monarchy and assassinate some of the country's top politicians.

Newin Chidchob, a key power broker in Thailand's governing coalition, claimed he was one of the targets, the others being Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva, Deputy PM Suthep Thaugsuban, Defense Minister Prawit Wongsuwan, and ex-Army chief Anupong Paochinda.

Mr Newin said he knew who was behind the plot, and all but named the man responsible as former PM Thaksin Shinawatra.

Police arrested the 11 suspects on the evening of October 2 at the Phu Fa resort in Tambon Mae On, where they were allegedly undergoing training in a "secret mission".

It has been reported that the arrests came after one of the group, Kittichai Chansawasdi, fled the camp "because he was unable to sustain the demanding regimen and had been physically assaulted during training".

Mr Kittichai told investigators the group had been at the resort since September 7 after receiving arms training near the Cambodian border.

Police refused to say whether the men were red-shirt fighters or linked to the infamous "men in black", who were believed to be

behind some of the violence during the red shirt protests in May.

Maj Gen Chaiya Sriramphankul, acting commander of Regional Police Bureau 5, said the men were cooperating with the authorities.

"We have information about the weapons training they received, and their involvement in various activities including bomb-related incidents, the anti-monarchy movement, assassination plots and other incidents which caused disruption to public order in Bangkok and elsewhere," he said.

On October 4, Mr Newin, de facto leader of the Bhumjai Thai Party, gave press interviews claiming the men had been paid 20 million baht to kill him.

He strongly hinted at Mr Thaksin's involvement.

"There are a few people in this country who hate me and are angry with me, but there is only one person who can afford to hire somebody to harm me," Mr Newin said.

When pressed for the name of the person, Mr Newin said, "I don't

need to explain. There's only one person. I'm courageous enough to say that he is my ex-master."

Mr Newin was formerly righthand man to Mr Thaksin and an executive of his now-defunct Thai Rak Thai Party.

As part of the 2007 court rul-

ing which dissolved Thai Rak Thai, Mr Newin was banned from holding political office for five years.

He remains the force behind Bhum Jai Thai, which holds several key Cabinet posts in coalition with the Democrat Party.

# Child porn outrage in central Bangkok

CHILD pornography openly on sale on Bangkok's Sukhumvit Road has incurred public outrage, it was reported on October 3.

The material, on sale in VCD format at just 80 baht per disc, was openly on display next to the latest Hollywood blockbusters.

It reportedly featured children from Thailand, Burma, China, the Philippines and Europe.

Many of the covers reportedly showed graphic images of children as young as seven engaged in sex acts.

"This is totally outrageous and should not be tolerated by the authorities," one ambassador who lives in the area said.

"You would have to look hard for any country in the world where this would be allowed, let alone on the main tourist street of the capital," the ambassador said.

A police officer who works on copyright infringement said the trade in pornographic videos was run by "influential people" who could not be touched by the authorities. — *Phuket Gazette* 



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# Phuket's week of spiritual reckoning

THOUSANDS of tourists will be arriving on the island this week to witness or take part in this year's Vegetarian Festival.

The festival will open with a ceremony near the Tin Mining Monument in Saphan Hin Park at 9am on October 7, followed by the traditional raising of go teng poles to welcome the Chinese gods at all participating shrines throughout the day.

On October 8, all participating shrines will hold ceremonies to make merit and to offer food to the warrior gods. Shrines will also select devotees to assist the mah song ("spirit mediums") during next year's festival.

The street processions will start October 9 and continue daily through to October 16.

The processions draw crowds along the streets of the routes, usually resulting in traffic jams in the immediate and nearby areas.

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

# Making a veritable meal of a festival

THE lead story on the front page of this issue says it all: the Phuket Vegetarian Festival is a commercial tourism success. Not only is this year's event being heralded to bring a much-welcomed 200-million-baht boost to the island's economy, it is expected to do so during one of Phuket's wettest months.

The festival is not unique and not original, but it has branded the others out of the competition.

There are many other similar festivals, such as the Brahman (Hindu) festivals on the Indian subcontinent, predating the Phuket Festival by centuries that also stage very similar processions, complete with obscure facial piercings, sometimes more so than the Phuket rendition. But tourists want to see the one on Phuket.

The Phuket festival has inspired other vegetarian festivals to be held elsewhere in Thailand this week, namely in other major tourist destinations such as Bangkok, Pattaya and Chiang Mai, as well as in Haad Yai, Phang Nga, Trang and Krabi. Even Penang has similar festivals and processions.

What the island can truly learn from the Vegetarian Festival is how to market an event. Its success has been no mere coincidence. The annual event has been managed, and managed well.

The processions will cause their usual major disruptions to traffic and everyday life wherever they pass by, and that is intentional. The inconvenience to those who do not want to

Even the *mah song* (spirit mediums) are managed. Each *mah song* joining the processions registers with one of the participating shrines. The organizers take no responsibility for "unregistered" *mah song*, and in years past the Shrines Association – the mainstay of the official organizing body of the event – internally "dealt with" a fake medium who repeatedly sliced open a pig's tongue instead of his own during a procession.

Even before this year's event got under way, it was an interesting surprise to hear senior officials hailing it as the 185th Vegetarian Festival. The year the Chinese laborers fell ill and observed abstinence (albeit bed-ridden abstinence) is well documented, but the year the first Vegetarian Festival was held to mark the occasion seems to be lost in the vague annals of Phuket history. We suppose, "Don't let accuracy get in the way of a good slogan" might have been adopted in this case.

But do such measures cause harm to anyone? Not likely. Do they bring business and help develop an aspect of Phuket's cultural identity? An undoubted yes. And that deserves commendation.

# Finance for foreigners buying motorbikes?

Is it possible for a foreigner living in Phuket to buy a new scooter on credit? It seems to be available for new cars but the bike showrooms tell me that credit is only available to Thai people even when offered a 50% deposit and sixmonthly payments.

Numchoke Pinyosamosorn, Manager of Suzuki dealership Ban Suzuki Plaza Co Ltd on Rattanakosin 200 Pi Road in Phuket Town, replies:

It is common policy among motorcycle showrooms throughout Phuket, including us, to minimize the risk of not being paid for motorcycles that are sold on finance.

That is why motorcycle dealerships do not offer loans to foreigners.

Foreigners can leave the coun-

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try anytime and may not return – and may not pay off the loan.

However, although we do not offer foreigners loans to buy our motorcycles, it is possible for them to buy on credit in the name of the company that the foreigners are shareholders in.

Prathum Saetan, Manager of Honda motorbike dealership United Phuket Commercial Co Ltd on Bangkok Rd in Phuket Town, replies:

We do not offer loans to foreigners to buy our motorcycles, but we do let them buy motorcycles in the name of the company that they are shareholders in.

The required documents to do

so are the company registration document, photocopies of your passport and/or the senior Thai in the company who will be signing on behalf of the company, as well as the house registration (tabien baan) document of the Thai person signing.

Pavadee Tongtae, sales representative at the Yamaha dealership Ruampong Motor on Surin Rd in Phuket Town, replies:

We allow foreigners to buy motorcycles though the companies they are shareholders in, but do not offer financing to individual foreigners.

The motorcycle will be registered in the name of the company.

However, we also require the foreigner to have a Thai national living in Phuket as a guarantor.

The guarantor is required to provide photocopies of his or her ID card and house registration document.

The *Gazette* notes that some banks offer personal loans to foreigners on a case by case basis.

# Green Fins fight for cleaner seas

# First PERSON

MOST of the garbage in the sea is trash that wasn't properly disposed of on land.

The first step in keeping our waters clean is by managing rubbish in our own houses. I am always recycling and since I started, I have noticed that I produce much less "waste".

Personally, I refuse to use plastic bags and I carry cloth bags with me all the time. If people start using cloth bags, they can easily see how many plastic bags they save in days, weeks and months.

Another simple thing is to use cloth handkerchiefs instead of disposable tissues.

My behaviors did not change all at once; it was a gradual process that has become easy to manage; just start one thing at a time.

Many people assume that all trash will be combined in the end, but if you notice the many people along the way taking out recyclables, which they earn a living from, we can make it easier for them by separating our rubbish.

A lot of people toss garbage anywhere, thinking collection and disposal are the responsibilities of government organizations. However, the burden is too much for local organizations.

Green Fins is working on a campaign to minimize our environmental impact and inform people about sea pollution and coral reefs,

which are living things – not rocks. Simple behavior such as not touching them, not anchoring in them and minimizing the amount of rubbish we produce can really help.

Another important point is that people should not feed fish, as they naturally feed on coral, which cleans it and allows it to grow; if they are fed by humans they will abandon their natural behavior. Also, bread left in the watter feeds aquatic weeds that can grow quickly and damage coral.

If the coral reefs are destroyed,

tourists will not come here for diving and instead go to other countries.

Many just want more people to come to Thailand [in the immediate future] and don't think about how the environment is impacted and its implications for tourism in the long-term.

As of right now, many good tourists and divers are going to other places.

We are trying to get communities to understand the problem, and even if we don't see any immediate results, at least we can inform people – especially the children.

# Colonizing Asia with calories

AMID all the hype over Apple's recent release of the 4G iPhone, Thai consumers have been drooling in expectation for another "American invasion": Krispy Kreme Donuts.

While failures in awarding service contracts and licensing have rendered the latest generation of "revolutionary" iPhones all but useless, the unleashing of oversweetened American donuts in the land of smiles promises to deliver.

From raising the "palate register" – rendering any fresh vegetable or meat tasteless – to boosting sales in over-sized clothing, the store's high-calorie treats are sure to attract attention.

Krispy Kreme opened its doors at Siam Paragon in Bangkok on the morning of September 28 to a line of people stretching a half-kilometer, some of whom had camped out overnight.

The pastry giant has seen similar devotion in its bid to glaze the East, with people waiting in line for an average of two hours at Tokyo locations – months after opening shop.

Fishing with a clever marketing scheme, Japanese consumers bit, and once the trend setters of Asia have caught on to something, it's only a matter of time until the East is conquered.

Americans, long ago desensitized to assaults on the tastebuds, have come to understand "supersize" as a way of life; Krispy Kreme is just the icing on the cake.

However, the export of this supersize lifestyle and all its tag-along health maladies is something worth considering.

Kreme, McDonald's, KFC and their ilk have been so successful in their campaings that they have convinced customers – who are otherwise disgusted by the thought of a 1,000 calorie plus "snack" – that they not only "like" their products, but "need" them.

I remember the Marlboro Man and Joe Camel; they too were amazingly successful at creating "false voids" that needed to be filled with their notorious products.

We don't see them anymore, and for good reason: they are a direct threat to our health.

With 20 or so locations set to open across Thailand – Phuket likely to be one – Krispy Kreme is another regiment joining the food wars, striving to increase obesity, diabetes and open up "fashionable" new markets for pharmaceuticals, over-sized elevators, extra-large cup holders, plus-sized clothes and motorized chairs on wheels.

Maybe it's time to scrutinize the marketing tactics of fast-food restaurants the same way we do tobacco and alcohol: Could we slap a picture of a 300kg diabetic man with an amputated foot on each box of donuts?

Barring some drastic – and highly unlikely – measures taken against fast-food marketing, the rising middle class of Thailand can take a good look at the US to see what's in store.

# Dr Narinrach Pichyakamin, Director of the Phuket Provincial Health Office replies:

Under Thai law, the Ministry of Health provides information only. We can accept complaints, but we must coordinate with other relevant agencies to follow up.

Suthasinee Jinowat, resident policy advisor at the Phuket City Municipality Health and Environment Division, replies: Phuket City Municipality provides rat poison and insecticide free to people living under the municipality's jurisdiction, including tenants along Thalang Road.

Residents can collect the poison free every Tuesday. A week later, our officers will go to the affected areas and check to make sure the pests are no longer there.

We can also have our officers spray an area with a poison specifically designed to kill rats.

This is more effective, but costs about 200 baht per application. Residents and tenants must apply to have us do this.

In this particular case, now that we have received the complaint we will assign an officer to inspect that area and exterminate the pests. Our officer will go early as we know this restaurant opens at about 5am.

If we continue to receive complaints about that area we will warn the restaurant owner. If the problem persists we will pass this case to our Sanitation Division, which has the power to order the business to close if it refuses to clean up.



# **Entrance fee for Bang Wad?**

Entry to Bang Wad Dam is still free, but how long will it be free to enter to enjoy?



# Increased traffic anticipated for Phuket Airport this high season

WITH high season approaching fast, international airlines have been launching new – and more –flight services to Phuket, with some starting this month.

Phuket International Airport Director Prateung Sornkham confirmed that from October 12, Qatar Airways will operate a new direct flight from Doha to Phuket via Kuala Lumpur.

Qatar's new service will see three flights each way, each week, served by a Boeing 777 configured to carry more than 300 passengers per trip.

Other airlines from the Middle East including Emirates and Etihad, are planning to open routes to Phuket as well, said Mr Prateung.

"It is great news that we have four and five-star airlines bringing international visitors from Middle Eastern countries, which are new [source] markets for Phuket," he added.

In addition, Russian national carrier Aeroflot, according to its website, will fly new Airbus A330 airliners between Moscow and Phuket three times a week, starting December 29.

The ramping up of services is the result of many international road shows promoting how attractive Phuket is in terms of food, accommodation, beaches and services, Mr Prateung said.

Currently about 100 flights a day arrive at Phuket Airport, said the airport director, adding that inbound arrivals are expected to increase to more than 120 flights during this high season.

"In the past three months, over 80,000 passengers visited Phuket each month. Of these, most were from Korea, China, Russia and Scandinavia," he explained.

Mr Prateung also affirmed that



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# Over 3,000 visit hospitality expo

FOLLOWING large turnouts for Phuket's first Asian Hospitality and Travel show from October 1 to 3, organizers have announced they plan to host the event annually.

# Into the jungle

# The Lost City of Z By David Grann

A CENTURY ago, Major Percy Fawcett was one of the world's most famous men. He was a legendary explorer, leading six expeditions between 1906 and 1914 into the heart of the Amazon jungle.


In 1925, he mounted another three man expedition into the Amazon in search of a lost city he named "Z". The three men walked into the jungle and never came out again. This made Percy Fawcett more famous than ever. Many expeditions were mounted in search of him and many of these, too, vanished in the great rain forest of Mato Grosso.

This is the story behind David Grann's The Lost City of Z (Vintage Books, New York, 2010, 400pp). Subtitled "A Tale of Deadly Obsession in the Amazon", the book chronicles the author's own search for the city of "Z" and the explorer.

David Grann is a mild-mannered 40-year-old writer for New Yorker magazine and utterly unequipped for the task - which makes it all the more compelling.

Grann also pulls out all the plot tricks of a very clever writer. First, he offers a teaser of a prologue as he gets lost in the jungle.

"I had lost my guide. I was out of food and water. . . Then I saw something moving in the trees. 'Who's there?' I called. There was no reply. A figure flitted among the branches, and then another. They were coming closer, and for the first time I asked myself, What the hell am I doing here?"



The book jumps around in time line and location, between Fawcett's life and Amazon expedition, to present day New York with the author searching for clues of what happened to Fawcett.

Eventually, we get to the author's own expedition.

He reaches the capital of Cuiaba, hires a guide and a pickup truck, and heads off through vast fields of soybeans that had once been virgin jungle. In two days they travel the distance that had taken the Fawcett party a month on foot.

This is when the reader begins to feel cheated. The author never spends a single night sleeping rough.

When he reaches the jungle and the last Indian village where Fawcett had slept, an old woman remembers the Fawcett party and confirms the tribe's memory that the three men left the village heading east into hostile Indian territory.


They observed campfire smoke for three days and then the smoke stopped. The white men were killed by Indians. End of story.

But there's an interesting coda. An American archaeologist named Michael Heckenberger spent many years in the region where Fawcett disappeared.

Heckenberger shows Grann the remains of moats, canals and bridges that indicate a huge Indian settlement, the kind described by the first Spanish explorers down the Amazon, proving that there had once been cities of "Z". They had however, been wiped out by white men's diseases.

THOUGH not an author by profession, Greg Mortenson's name is enveloping the literary world at the moment.

His passion is education, and his belief in its ability to free countries from poverty and extremism.

During the Bush and Rumsfeld era he did all he could to promote his alternative and controversial method of fighting terrorism.

Instead of spending huge amounts of public money on arms for war, Mortenson suggests using it to educate Pakistan's and Afghanistan's future generations.

His argument is sane and intelligent, in a time when foreign policy is driven by post 9/11 hysteria.

His life's work of building schools in Pakistan and Afghanistan through the non-profit Central Asia Institute (CAI) has been documented in his New York Times number-one bestseller, *Three Cups* of Tea: One Man's Mission to Promote Peace...One School At A Time.

It has sold 3.5 million copies and been published in 39 countries.

By 2009 - after 15 years of work - Mortenson had established and supported 131 schools in rural and volatile regions of Pakistan

and Afghanistan. These schools provide education to over 58,000 children, including 44,000 girls, where few education opportunities existed before.

He is also the author of the new bestseller Stones into Schools: Promoting Peace with Books, Not Bombs, in Afghanistan and Pakistan. This is a first-person narrative that takes a more detailed look at his theory and the first hand experience it is based on.

His full biography details his life growing up in Tanzania, serving in the US Army in Germany, the death of his sister, Christa, from a massive epileptic seizure and his attempt to climb Pakistan's K2 in her honor.

In 2009, Mortenson received Pakistan's highest civil award, Sitara-e-Pakistan ("Star of Pakistan") for his 15-year effort to promote education and literacy in rural areas.

Several US Congressional representatives nominated Mortenson for the Nobel Peace Prize in both 2008 and 2009. The award recipient is chosen by a secret process and announced in October the following year.

# Life & style Deciphering acronyms The style in the styl

NEARLY every profession serves up a healthy portion of acronym soup, but the TEFL industry has a larger portion than most. Differences between meanings range from the minute, to the major, but the following acronyms are so basic, every teacher ought to know what they stand for.

English language teaching (ELT) and teaching English to speakers of other languages (TESOL) are both umbrella terms for the industry as a whole.

Regardless of location, ELT is not about teaching students their first language (L1). Instead, it's about teaching English as an additional language (L2 or higher).

Demand is high on Phuket for English as a foreign language (TEFL) classes, as English is not the native language here.

Outside class, students typically receive very little exposure to English, so teachers have to consider this when planning lessons. Teaching English as a second language (TESL) is done with non-native speakers inside English speaking countries. There, both students and teachers benefit from

learners' exposure to English outside their lessons. Those working in Phu-

ket's businesses or vocational schools are often teaching English for specific purposes (ESP). They're engaged in task-based language teaching (TBLT) where vocabulary and conversational skills are specific to the learners' industry. Others teach English for academic purposes (EAP). Conducted in preparation for secondary school or university entrance exams, EAP usually places an emphasis on reading, writing

In the Classroom

There are three popular assessments of English language proficiency. The international English language testing system (IELTS) is managed by Cambridge University and the British Council (BC). The test has two versions: academic and general training. The competing systems

have similar versions put out by USbased Educational Testing

Service (EST). They are the general test of English for international communication (TOEIC) and the academic test of English as a foreign language (TOEFL). When looking for entry-level qualifications, Cambridge University's certification in English language teaching to adults (CELTA) is recognized by most as the industry's standard. Phuket is home to many other similar courses.

Cambridge also offers a diploma

master's degree (MA) in TEFL. Without one of these advanced

qualifications, you can probably rule out working in Phuket's international schools: British International School (BIS), Phuket International Acadamy (PIA), Quality Schools International (QSI) and Head Start.

Many government schools in Thailand have an English Program (EP). Schools with small budgets may only have a mini English Program (MEP) where students simply get a few more hours of English each week. Some government schools do not have an English program at all.

Every teacher in Thailand needs a work permit (WP) from the Ministry of Labor (MoL) and schools in Thailand are regulated by the Ministry of Education (MoE) who ultimately approve our teacher's license (TL). In addition to this, the Teachers Council of Thailand (TCT) stipulates that foreign teachers take a course on Thai language, culture and professional ethics in order to qualify for a TL. However, enforcement of this is erratic, and many foreigners are left asking, What's this for (WTF)?

We'll explore the TCT course and its exams in next month's column.



ASIDE from the thunderous roar of exploding fire crackers and the shocking ritualistic piercings of the mah song spirit mediums, the Phuket Vegetarian Festival has another allure: great vegetarian food.

From October 8 to 16 from noon until late, hundreds of food stalls line Ranong Road in Phuket Town, serving tasty morsels not usually found on the island.

Some vendors come from as far away as Nakhon Sri Thammarat and Singburi provinces to sell their vegetarian treats over the nine-day festival.

Here, we tell you where to find some of the best festival fare.

Where: Je Ple kiosk, Ranong Road, opposite the wet market. Why here: This steaming little soup stall has been a regular fixture at the festival for the past 20 years. Last year, the popularity of Je Ple's vegetarian pink soup with noodles (yong tau foo, 35 baht) commonly known in Thai as yen

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ta fo – kept stall owner Watchara Chupen, his wife and their staff busy serving almost 24 hours a day.

In your bowl: The ingredients used in Mr Watchara's prized soup are soya "meat" (not really meat), snow fungus, wood ear fungus, fried taro root and fried vegetable dumplings. It's not a task for Mr Watchara to get his ingredients in the morning as the wet market is just 20 meters away from his stall.

Where: Loba Beng Song stall, 15 meters north of Je Ple on Ranong Road.

Why here: Run by the Thepkulmanon family, this stall serves loba (40 baht): the vegetarian version of the pork roll counterpart, commonly known as lor bak in Chinese-Hokkien dialect.

In your bowl: Served as either, fried firm tofu or malleable tofu served with chili dipping sauce. The fried tofu is cut into triangular mouthfuls and mixed with corn and minced Shiitake mushrooms. Spring rolls made from minced pumpkin, yam bean and taro root are also one of the stall's popular delicacies.

Where: Pae Taw stall, 30 meters north of Loba Beng Song on Ranong Road.

Why here: Food vendor Yupin Ongprueska serves exceptional ow taw (fried taro roots mixed with flour, 30 baht).

The ever-happy Mrs Yupin has been serving her special dish for the past decade, using a recipe passed down from her mother.

In your bowl: Mrs Yupin mixes rice flour and cassava flour together with water, and then deep fries diced taro roots, wood ear fungus, peas, sliced baby corn and bean sprouts in a pan.

To top it off, the ow taw will have deep-fried soya "meat" added before serving.

Where: Boonniyom Restaurant on Chao Fa East Road, Chalong, 500 meters before the roundabout heading south.

Why here: Restaurant manager and 12-year vegan Pavinee Phichiensoothon is passionate about vegetarian and vegan food – and it shows in her dishes.

Her restaurant is open from 5am-6pm over the festival period.

"Eating less meat can help your body and have a positive influence on your life," says the Nakhon Sri Thammarat native.

**In your bowl:** Dishes of note here are Kee Lek curry (senna leaf curry with fried sajor-caju mushrooms, 25 baht), Tay Poh curry (a curry with morning glory, mushroom and soya "meat" or fried tofu, 25 baht), and Kua Gling (fried soya meat with spice, 25 baht).

# StJohn MacKay

STJOHN (pronounced "Sen Gin") MacKay has been with Asia Island Homes (AIH) for ten years. He began working there with his cousin Colin MacKay, who was building some of the island's first luxury villas. Beginning with Baan Chai Nam and finishing with Samsara, AIH built to international standards.

The company soon recognized that StJohn could write better descriptions of new music than anyone else and gave him access to an Apple computer to write summaries of new releases for the company's newsletters.

"During the 1990s, I had a particular interest in what is known as Indie music, recorded on independent labels."

StJohn spent most of his spare time checking out the bands in pubs. He estimates he attended 150 gigs a year on average.

"It was exciting to have seen a new band in the back room of a pub with maybe 30 people in the audience, and for that same band to become a sensation some time later."

He was promoted at Crysalis Records as a buyer for their independent new music as he best knew the trends in the music industry. In his spare time, he traveled to Poland, India and the Czech Republic, long before they became major tourist destinations.

But by the late 1990s, he had become disenchanted with the music scene in the UK.


"The music industry in England lost my interest as there was more focus on the bottom line than on letting new talent develop. In 1998, I decided to take a year off and travel. I came to Phuket on my way to Darwin, Australia."

StJohn spent a year in Darwin, drawn to what he describes as a phenomenal music scene. When he returned to England a year later to resume his life, he discovered he had changed.

"I arrived at Heathrow at 5am and by 10am I had bought a ticket to Phuket. There was no going back to England for me."

When he inherited AIH, he quickly became one of Phuket's online marketing experts. StJohn refers to himself as an "information alchemist" who can analyze a website and improve its effectiveness. His clients are located in Phuket, Singapore and Australia.

In his spare time he has been cycling 200 kilometers a week and volunteering his online skills with local charities.

Known for its awesome scenery and diving, Krabi is also a place where you can find great food at bargain prices

TRAVELERS visiting Krabi can find plenty of eateries with a spoonful of some of Southeast Asia's most flavorsome culinary delights.

Follow your nose – or the locals – to the best spots. Thai cuisine varies considerably, and in Krabi, it's easy to dip your spoon into a local dish and find a dash of Indian, a sprinkle of Malay or a splash of Chinese flavor.

Chaokhun Restaurant is easy to find from the morning market in the town center – just walk up the hill and turn left at the crossroads; the restaurant is on the right-hand side and opens at the crack of dawn.

It's an intimate set-up on the terrace of a northern-style wooden house, overlooking a small garden, and the perfect spot for a Chinese local-style breakfast.

A tray of steamed and deep fried dim sum (10 baht per dish) is offered to each table.

After a leisurely breakfast, flag down a purple songtaew and head for Neua Klong, 17 kilometers south of Krabi Town. The journey takes 30 minutes and costs 30 baht. Jump out when you see the red tower of the Chinese temple, (Wat Jeen).

Inside the main hall, nuns will show you how to make a Buddhist offering (wai phra) by kneeling before a Buddha image and holding incense between your palms in a prayer-like gesture. There is no admission charge but it is customary to make a small donation.

Back on the main road, continue south on foot until you reach Neua Klong market. This market specializes in dried goods used in Chinese-influenced dishes. However, you can find everything from pigs heads to huge shellfish.

From the market, take a motorbike taxi to Lan Rad Na, which is less than a kilometer south out

of town. The ride should cost no more than 20 baht. Serving up their signature Thai-Chinese dish of noodles, vegetables and pork or seafood in a thick broth, this is the perfect spot for a hearty lunch.

After lunch, hop in a *songtaew* and head back to Krabi town. Ask your driver to stop at Tiger Cave Temple (Wat Tham Seua) in Talat Khao. It's a 20 minute trip and costs just 20 baht.

It's an arduous 40 minute climb up 1,237 steps to reach the summit, but being greeted by the huge Buddha set against the sweeping view of the region makes it well worthwhile. This climb is only recommended for people in good health and under the age of 60.

After that uphill burn you will be ready to refuel. It's still early afternoon so take another songtaew back into town and board a white songtaew destined for Ao Nang. Ask the driver to stop at Chiang Mai Restaurant in Klong Chilat. It's a 20 minute drive and will cost 20 baht.

The deliciously creamy khao soi,

signature dish of northern Thailand is a must-try, and the nam prik ong dipping sauce suits western palettes as it is a lot less robust than its southern counterpart. A selection of snacks plus cold beers for two won't cost more than 250 baht.

Krabi is small and very easy to get around, so even at 4pm, it isn't too late to embark on another tour. After taking a songtaew back into town, hire one of the eager longtail boatmen by the river to take you on a tour of one of Krabi's most famous rock formations, Khao Kanab Nam. Trips vary in price, but a short tour to the rocks and mangrove forest should cost between 700 baht and 1,000 baht.

As the sun begins to set, take a motorbike taxi to Loso Restaurant on Krabi Road. Here, you'll find the province's best Isarn food for the change in your pocket. This rickety little shack is packed to the rafters five days a week and is the perfect spot for dinner.

Som tam kor moo yang (papaya salad with pork) adds an extra meaty bite to this classic northeastern dish, while som tam ma muang (mango salad made in similar style) has a zestier flavor. Dinner for two plus a few cold beers won't cost more than 500 baht. Loso is open from 11am until 11pm.

Buses leave from the Phuket Town bus station every hour and the journey takes around three hours (155 baht, from 6am-5pm daily). Alternatively, hire a car for about 1,000 baht per day.

# Phuket 2.0: Moving past a troubled year

OVER 120 tourism, real estate and business leaders came together for the Phuket 2.0 workshop at the Sheraton Grande Laguna on October 1.

Industry leaders discussed a variety of potential growth markets for Phuket over the next decade.

Speaking for the hotel and property industries was Michael Ayling, Managing Director of Laguna Resorts and Hotels.

Mr Ayling pointed out factors that had adversely affected both industries, but made it clear that the hotel industry had not been hit as hard as the property market.

According to Mr Ayling, past influences on the markets included the global economic recession, political instability in Thailand and the US and UK property market crash.

He said that the financial crisis resulted in a lack of available finances for consumers to purchase properties and that political instability resulted in foreigners being reluctant to invest in Thailand.He also pointed out that the strengthening of the Thai baht against the euro, pound and dollar made investment in Thailand much less cost-effective.

Despite all the negatives, there are still buyers, Mr Ayling said, pointing out that prices have lowered and the market seems to be moving toward residential and lifestyle purchases more than investments in vacation properties.

Mr Ayling reassured those attending the workshop that the

Phuket hotel sector has not been negatively affected to the same extent as the property markets have been, adding that "Phuket is very resilient".

"Phuket always bounces back quickly after crises," he said.

After a difficult 2009, the industry experienced a positive first quarter this year.

The second and third quarters this year were impacted by the political instability in Bangkok, lowering revenues to 25% below expectations.

The recovery in the fourth quarter indicates there will be a strong start next year.

Mr Ayling added that the main driving factors for Phuket are to maintain traditional tourist markets such as Russia, Europe and the UK and also develop new markets, which currently include India and China.

Although the health of the global economy is uncertain and the availability of finances for property purchases is now low, the idea that Southeast Asia has no emerging alternative to Phuket as competition is a positive sign, Mr Ayling said.

"The fundamentals of the fantastic Thai service culture, great beaches and climate will always differentiate Phuket," Mr Ayling said. He went on to say that Phuket's

He went on to say that Phuket's infrastructure is improving with road and airport upgrades, and the continuous development of marinas, shopping centers, international schools and convention centers.

However, a public transportation system is needed, he said.

"As far as the next decade goes, despite the number of uncertainties, the medium to long-term outlook is very positive.

"There are likely to be bumps along the way, but Phuket has been and will continue to be very resilient in facing its challenges ahead," he said.





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# **Ultra Villas** on the rise in Nai Thon

ONE of the island's most picturesque beaches, Nai Thon, is undergoing a massive makeover.

Over the past few years the "UltraVilla" luxury estate Malaiwana has continued to evolve into one of the island's premium addresses.

Speaking to partner and developer Stephen Paine who also spearheaded the successful Surin Heights estate, he was keen to talk about two new projects being launched by the group.

First is the 12-unit, upscale boutique Malaiwana Residences with "to die for" West Coast ocean views. Unit sizes for the "uber" apartments are 600 square meters, featuring 18-meter private swimming pools.

Configured with eight duplexes and four penthouses; prices range between 85 and 95 million baht.

With a public launch set for mid-November, four units have already been sold to buyers looking for top-shelf projects. Construction will start early next year and is expected to be complete by 2013.



Second is the 140-seat Malaiwana Beach Club and dining lounge, located on one rai of land at the southern end of Nai Thon Beach.

The venue will also be open to the public.

The new venue will provide some stiff competition for Catch Beach Club in Surin and Baba club at Sri Panwa resort when it opens in the first quarter of next vear.

In other developments: At the north end of the Nai Thon Beach, the 281-room, internationally branded Pullman Arcadia resort will be changing the area in a major way.

International hotel chain ACCOR are also eyeing the Nai Thon area.

Across the street, another site is reportedly going to be turned into a well-known branded hotel.

From an impact perspective, the growing inventory of hotel

rooms does pose questions about how Nai Thon can cope with this many tourists.

At high tide, beach seating remains limited, and no doubt the "Surin Beach effect" with tourists having to pay for a seat and service, looks to be inevitable.

There are two distinct camps in the mass-tourism model, and there are no better examples of these than in Nai Thon.

First is the "UltraVillas" camp dotting hillsides and coastlines consuming forest and natural resources. Those buyers tend to have minimal impact on Nai Thon Beach, with most staying in the confines of their sizable villas for days on end.

The second camp is made up of larger hotels – which are coming in fast to such a small beach. It seems things are going to get a little crowded.

Maybe a government zoning incentive might help here, or a building initiative, that could give incentives to existing residential and hotel owners to upgrade and modernize buildings already there.


A recent announcement of new environmental regulations by the government is creating a rush for developers to get building permits processed before they take effect.

Sometime this month, a new land usage plan for all of Phuket will be released by the govern-

Early indications point to a marked new control strategy. However, the plan will not seriously address redevelopment or control of specific hotel zones, it has been reported.

There is no doubt that Ultra-Villas are one of Phuket's most appealing property products, but putting them into a mass model could be a step in the wrong direction for the long run.

# New phases going up fast

THE Royal Place Condominium, located behind a wall of advertising and commercial buildings at the Tesco-Lotus intersection, is entering its third and final stage of completion.

When completed in 2012, the project – spread out on five rai of land – will feature three apartment towers with an additional "shared facilities" building.

The first L-shaped apartment tower is the largest and is the only finished building in The Royal Place Condominium, having opened for residents in 2009. All of the building's 158 units have been sold.

This bodes well for the second and third towers. The second is set for completion in May 2011 and construction has just begun on the third.

The project was initiated in 2007 with overall costs estimated at about two billion baht.

According to developers, the staggered progress has nothing to do with budget problems, but is down to the limited availability of the Bangkok-based Syntec Construction Co Ltd.

Each of the apartment towers will be eight stories high. They vary in size, with the second tower featuring 102 luxury apartments,

and 171 in the third.

The units themselves are not identical, with the smallest being 30 square meters and the largest being over two times the size at 73sqm.

Prices vary as well: between five and seven million baht.

The condominiums are all very

stylish, with designer Architist Co Ltd having worked on the exterior.

Vichien Supataragul, the project president, explained that the building was designed with modern living in mind and that only premium quality materials have been used in the interior design.

Residents can also enjoy the swimming pool and restaurant in the central building. When fully complete, this building will include a clubhouse and shopping facilities.

and that only premium quality Manassanan Thiensawangkun, materials have been used in Deputy Managing Director said

demand is high for condominiums at The Royal Place.

"About 80% of the units have sold in the second building, and 10% of the units in the third tower have already sold," he said.

Mr Supataragul added that their target clientele were business people who live in Phuket.



# On the bright track with this bloomer

# Gardening

ON FLOWER power alone, the bougainvillea would rate highly on any top 20 list. Of all the flowering shrubs available to gardeners in Phuket, the bougainvillea is one of the most popular. And deservedly so.

There is scarcely a country soi where you will not find the shrub decorating the roadside. Indeed in many places, it has adapted itself to highly unpromising conditions.

The road chiseled through the hills between Karon and Kata, for example, has bougainvilleas everywhere, and though they are frequently cut back, they continue to add a splash of color to the rocky hillsides.

They seem to do extremely well on this island, better here than in their much-vaunted Mediterranean setting, where the cold winters can seriously hamper growth.

In Andalucia, I attempted to grow a number before one finally prospered.

Once established though, it grew into a huge bush whose thorny tentacles embraced the entire balcony.

The bougainvillea is not native to either Europe or Asia. It hails from Brazil, where it was discovered by a French explorer by the name of - you guessed it -Louis de Bougainville.

It quickly became popular in eighteenth century Europe, and as happens with popular plants, was soon being hybridized.

Over the next few months, the *Gazette* will feature the top 20 island plants for your Phuket patch. Each week we will review the visual appeal, ease of cultivation and adaptability of each plant. Other virtues such as scent, foliage and blooming period will also be considered. Feel free free to add to the list...

The true flowers are small, white and insignificant; the real display is provided by the clustered bracts, three to six in number, that encircle the flowers. These bracts are paper-thin, a trait which has given rise to the popular name of "paper flower".

While the most common color is pink or purple, many striking cultivars have been produced in a range of colors ranging from pure white through to scarlet and deep crimson.

Now there is even a chrome yellow cultivar. Orange-scarlet hybrids are especially attractive. Double varieties include a deep magenta.

The attractive foliage has paired leaves which are often reddish green in color when young.

But be warned, as with so many tropical shrubs, the stems are armed with lethal spines.

Bougainvillea is in essence a vigorous, woody vine with a naturally sprawling habit, and it will scramble without ceremony over any plants that get in its way.

Since the stems can reach several meters in length, the plant will need to be regularly pruned, unless you plan to cover a large area of wall or trellis very quickly.

Unlike a "true" vine, bougain-

villea produces no tendrils, so it may well need support.

Certainly, it does not object to clipping. Hard pruning after blooming will promote a bushier habit and more flowers.

It is also good practice to pinch out the last half inch of new growth to encourage lateral sprouting below the tip.

Because it tolerates pruning, the bougainvillea is often used as a hedge. The spikes will certainly help to repel would-be intruders.

The bougainvillea is a sun-lover, and it flowers best in the dry season when the hours of sunlight are at their peak. Five hours a day is it's minimum requirement.

Give it too much water and too little sunlight and it will grow and grow without producing much in the way of color. So just remember that it is less likely to bloom effectively in the monsoon when its root system is moist.

And it will not need much watering in the dry season. This makes bougainvillea most definitely a low maintenance plant.

So how does the bougainvillea rate? Highly for visual appeal, length of flowering period and general adaptability.

It is accepting of dry conditions, has a high tolerance to salt-laden winds, and is remarkably resistant to disease.

Bougainvilleas will take readily from cuttings and can be cultivated as pot plants. Some of the most spectacular and multi-hued specimens can be seen growing in containers in local nurseries. Many are venerable – at least 10 years old.

The downsides are that despite having a thin root system, bougainvilleas are gross feeders and will

take both nutrients and space from any plants in their vicinity.

Their growth habit is unwieldy and invasive. They have vicious spines, and do not attract butterflies because they possess no perfume.

But then again, a tropical garden without a bougainvillea is quite unthinkable.

# Tip of the week

# Helping to balance nature

THE chemical pesticide industry is a multi-billion dollar business. Fortunately, since Rachel Carson's book "Silent Spring", it is now more environmentally conscious. Nonetheless, most chemical pesticides are not selective in what they target.

In Thailand's paddy fields, where rice leaf hoppers are a problem, these pests are naturally controlled by spiders which may eat as many as fifteen a day. But the application of commercial dust pesticides will eliminate the spiders as well.

Organic pesticides require

less monitoring. Of these, the safest marketed ones are plant-derived. For example, pyrethrum from the Dalmatian chrysanthemum; rotenone from legumes; sabadilla from the lily of the same name; and potassium bicarbonate is the main constituent of Kaligreen and Greencure (which also acts as a fungicide).

In their different ways, they are all effective, and all degrade within a matter of days.

Using these responsibly, will help preserve the balance of nature in your garden.

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
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
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# FC Phuket ready for playoffs

The fixture list has not been particularly kind to FC Phuket who start off with two away games. While their form at Surakul Stadium has been imperious, the Southern Sea Kirin have sometimes struggled away from home.

The opening match is away to Samut Prakarn, who finished second in the Central & Eastern League. The second match is away to Rayong, who finished third in the Central & Eastern League.

It will be essential that FC Phuket can get some points on the board before their first home game against Chai Nat, who finished second in the Northern League.

The other two teams in the group, Loei City and Bangkok FC, could provide the stiffest tests for FC Phuket. Both won their divisions and will feel they are more than capable of finishing in the top two of the playoff group.

FC Phuket travel to Bangkok FC and then have back-to-back games with Loei City immediately before the home game against Bangkok FC.

These four matches are likely to go a long way towards deciding who wins this group.

The good news for FC Phuket is that they finish with two home games, against Rayong and Samut Prakan. If the side are still in contention at this stage, they will feel confident of taking maximum points from the final two matches at "Fortress Surakul".

After all the work that has gone into the radically improved side, it would be a major disappointment if FC Phuket missed out on promotion. They won their division by an incredible 14 points and are clearly far too good for the third tier of Thai football. However, that will count for nothing if FC Phuket are unable to prosper at the end of season playoffs.

It has been an incredible season so far for FC Phuket, but now it all comes down to 10 matches.

A PHUKET fighter traveled to Burma last week to participate in a brutal bare knuckle *Lethwei* 

US born Cyrus Washington has been based at Tiger Muay Thai in Phuket for over two years and has fought over 50 times in Thailand.

Lethwei is the Burmese equivalent of Muay Thai, but unlike the Thai version of the sport fighters in Lethwei do not wear any gloves.

There are a few other differences between the two sports, as Washington would discover:

"There weren't supposed to be any headbutts but my opponent did it anyway. He kept leading with his head and eventually he paid the price as he ran into an elbow.

"The guy was a Burmese superstar, Saw Nga, and he couldn't

believe that I had knocked him down. His corner called a two minute time out, which apparently is allowed under *Lethwei* rules!

"After that, he was afraid and kept falling over, but I had broken my hand in the earlier round and couldn't finish him," he said

The fight was eventually declared a draw but they decided to award Washington the belt anyway on account of his opponent's reluctance to engage and the fact that his corner had bent the rules by calling a time out.

Washington has also fought in Malaysia, Singapore, Russia and Australia. "There is a big difference between Myanmar and Thailand," he concluded.
